## Police search for shotgun slayers

CANTON—An unpaid \$50 loan and a ring used for collateral proved fatal for what police think was an innocent victim of circumstances in the wee hours of Tuesday morning.

Terry Lewis Buchman, 22, of Canton was found slain in a field at the corner of Joy and Ridge roads by Sheriff's deputies shortly after 2 a.m. He had been shot once in the back with a .22, and once in the back of the head with a shotgun.

A friend, Lloyd C. Cash, 19, who

was with him at the time of the homicide, was beaten with a rifle butt.

Sheriff's detectives have been attempting to piece together the series of events that led to Buchman's death, and are presently searching for "three prime suspects."

First degree murder warrants were issued yesterday (Wednesday) for three former Plymouth High School students: Barry L. Provow, 27, his wife, Leslie Cassidy Provow, 22, and Robert W. Umney, 24.

Both Provow and Umney have police records and were recently pa-

roled from Jackson Prison, where they had been serving terms for armed robbery. According to the detective bureau, the events leading to the tragedy began sometime prior to Tuesday, when Provow allegedly arranged for a loan of \$500.

A diamond ring was given as collateral, but police theorize that the money never changed hands.

Police feel Provow sought the help of Cash to get either the money or the ring back.

In turn, Cash went to his friend, Buchman, who was thought to be

friendly with the individual that was holding the ring.

Cash and Buchman attempted to arrange a meeting between the two parties involved in the loan at the Deer Creek Apartment complex in Canton. Police hypothesize that the man with the ring never showed.

At 12:45 a.m. on Tuesday, the Sheriff's department received an abduction call saying that two men had been forced into a car (Cash and Buchman).

At 2:06 a.m., some 90 minutes later,

the Sheriff received another call asking them to go to Joy and Ridge in the northwestern portion of Canton Township.

When they arrived, they found Buchman dead in a field on the south-eastern corner of Joy and Ridge.

Allegedly, the owner of the ring had become angered when the man who defaulted on the loan didn't show at the meeting place.

Cash said he and Buchman were forced into the car by their attackers with a .22 rifle and a shotgun.

Cash was subsequently beaten with a rifle butt while in the car.

When the car arrived at the corner of Ridge and Joy, it stopped. Cash said he was forced to lie face down in a ditch, but Buchman attempted to escape. Two male attackers pursued the fleeing Buchman and he was shot in the back with the .22 rifle.

When the two men chased Buchman, the woman was left to stand guard over Cash, still lying face down in the roadside ditch.

Cash, however, fled in the opposite direction when he saw the men chase Buchman.

Sometime after Cash fled, Buchman was fatally shot in the back of the head with a shotgun.

Cash, meanwhile, reached safety at a nearby home, where the second call was made to the sheriff.

Buchman lived at 7704 Alton Drive in the Holiday Park Subdivision. His friend Cash is also a resident of Canton and police believe the three attackers also live in the township.

Services for Buchman will be held in the Schrader funeral home on Friday, Jan. 30. A '71 graduate of Plymouth-Salem, he worked until recently at Associated Spring.

He is survived by: his father Thomas A. Buchman; his mother Ivel, two brothers, Timothy of Canton and Thomas of Ferndale; and his maternal grandparents Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert Schmitz of Midland.

He will be buried in Riverside cemetery.

## Another Mocerri PUD denied

CANTON—"I may speak for myself. I hope not, but if a builder comes back to us after having performed work in a shoddy manner, you'd better believe he'll have a hard row to hoe if wants to build again in Canton," stated angry Supervisor Robert Greenstein.

Greenstein was talking to Gilbert Franklin, attorney and representative for the Dominic Mocerri Development company.

Franklin had applied to the board

for a PUD agreement on an altered plan, for Canton Center Woods.

The board, following the recommendation of planner Mike Manore, rejected his application and referred him to the planning commission.

The attitude of the board appeared to be unfriendly toward Franklin as frequent mention was made of another Mocerri development, Pickwick Village, located at Lilley and Barchester.

Numerous complaints have origi-

nated out of the Pickwick subdivision, some which have not been rectified by the builders 1½ years after completion of the houses.

Bill Vitti, president of the Pickwick Homeowners Association, said, "I have here in my hand a bunch of complaints—probably between 25 and 30. Some of them are for some of the first homes built in the subdivision. Any claim that all is taken care of in Pickwick is incorrect."

Greenstein was more vehement, "I was over there and I saw the mess—I saw it on television, I heard it on the radio, and I saw it in the newspapers. People had to give up their rights to live in those homes because they had no where else to go."

When Franklin suggested he was not to blame, Greenstein responded, "Come on, Mr. Franklin, we have talked privately and I know that you are a representative of this company."

## A rare treat for high school classes

## Mime students ready antics

CANTON—Arrayed in black leotards, brightly-colored T-shirts and faces painted white, 31 members of a Centennial Educational Park pantomime class will perform their silent antics Friday and Saturday at 8 p.m. in the Plymouth Canton High School auditorium.

Thirty skits, ranging from the bizarre to slapstick to heavy drama and

written by the students themselves, will make up the program as well as an impromptu skit, performed each night by the student whose name is drawn from a hat.

The pantomime class, now in its third year at the Centennial Educational Park, is an unusual feature of a high school curriculum. Drama teacher Gloria Logan rates the class as the

only of its kind in Michigan or perhaps in the entire country.

MRS. LOGAN, who performed with a pantomime company at Eastern Michigan University five or six years ago, spearheaded the establishment of the one-semester course, offered as an English elective once a year.

"In pantomime, the only thing you have to rely on is yourself," Mrs.

Logan explained. "A lot of people have trouble communicating with their voices, let alone without them."

"It's up to what you can do with your body and hands and expressions in pantomime," she said. "A lot of people don't realize how much they communicate without saying anything."

Her students agreed.

"I THINK pantomime is basic for any actor or actress," said senior Kevin Rosner, "because it stresses body control. If you can blossom your imagination in pantomime, you can do it with dialogue."

Senior Charles Burr added, "It helps develop the body for movement in all kinds of drama."

Body movements and facial expressions are key factors in good pantomime, Mrs. Logan said. Students perform muscle-limbering exercises on a regular basis to achieve awkward movements with ease.

"It's almost a modern dance technique," she said.

The exercises also provide bases for skit ideas. One skit scheduled for this weekend's performance is based on a "mirror image" exercise. Mrs. Logan explained, in which two performers stand face-to-face and duplicate each other's body movements.

AN IMPROMPTU skit will mark a highlight of the program, she said. One student, whose name is drawn from a hat, will perform an on-the-spot assignment.

"Six students got brave and put their names in a hat," Mrs. Logan said. "That's a brave thing to do."

Rosner, whose name could appear from the hat this weekend, admits the impromptu skit is a little bit "scary."

"But that's the fun of it," Rosner said.

Students will appear on stage in similar costumes and white, red-lipped pantomime faces.

"The pantomime face is supposed to eliminate features and put forth the most expressive features—the mouth and the eyes," Mrs. Logan explained. "This way performers can also change from one character to the next without changing costumes and make-up."

Mrs. Logan said some of her pantomime students will probably continue in the dramatic field.

"This class isn't specifically designed for theater-oriented kids," she said, "but I have a great number who do decide to go on. I'm always surprised how many of them do. Drama isn't a field with job or monetary security."

Admission to this weekend's "Pantomime '75" show is 50 cents.

## Rebates spur auto buyers

Plymouth and Canton residents are jamming showrooms of local car dealerships these days to take advantage of rebate plans offered by American auto companies.

Spokesmen for six new car dealers in the Plymouth-Canton area say sales and traffic in their showrooms have been "super" since the rebate plans went into effect a few weeks ago and hope rebates will provide "the shot in the arm" the slumping economy needs.

REBATES AT area new car dealerships slice \$200 to \$600 off some new-car prices. Although rebate plans at all four auto companies end with the Feb. 28 deadline for cars in inventory, plans under which "rebate" cars can be ordered differ from company to company.

Chrysler Corp., which spearheaded the rebate idea, provides the most expanded rebate plan for new-car orders. Chrysler customers can purchase cars in stock or order others covered by the rebate umbrella until the Feb. 28 cut-off date.

Ford Motor Co. products must be ordered by this Saturday, Feb. 1, or delivered by Feb. 28 to retain rebate eligibility.

General Motors and American Motor Corp. products must be delivered by Feb. 28. GM and AMC cars delivered past that date will be ineligible for rebates.

Despite differences in rebate plans, local sales for all four auto companies have climbed out of the previous slump.

"The amount of traffic and the cars we've sold is fabulous," said Ray Dalto, general manager of Leo Calhoun Ford, 41001 Plymouth Road, Plymouth, of business under the rebate plan. "The response has been super. For a single week period, we sold more cars last week than all last year."

"It proves the price of a car was too high."

Ford is offering a \$200 rebate on 1975 Pintos and Mavericks, a \$300 rebate on two bottom-of-the-line Mustangs, a \$500 rebate on the Mustang Mach I and Ghia and a \$350 rebate on the Super Cab truck.

Customers are purchasing cars not covered by the rebate umbrella, Dalto said, as well as those that are.

Rebates have spurred "at least a 50 per cent increase" in sales at Leo Calhoun, Dalto said, where "business has been terrible up until now."

If sales continue at their present pace, the dealership may rehire six employees laid off during the previous slump, Dalto said.

IN THE Lincoln-Mercury division, Ford is offering a \$500 rebate on 1974 Capris and a \$200 rebate on 1975 Comets.

All Ford rebates are offered on check-after-purchase or down-payment basis.

Unlike Ford and GM, which issues rebates the same way as Ford, Chrysler and AMC rebates are sent in the mail after a car is purchased.

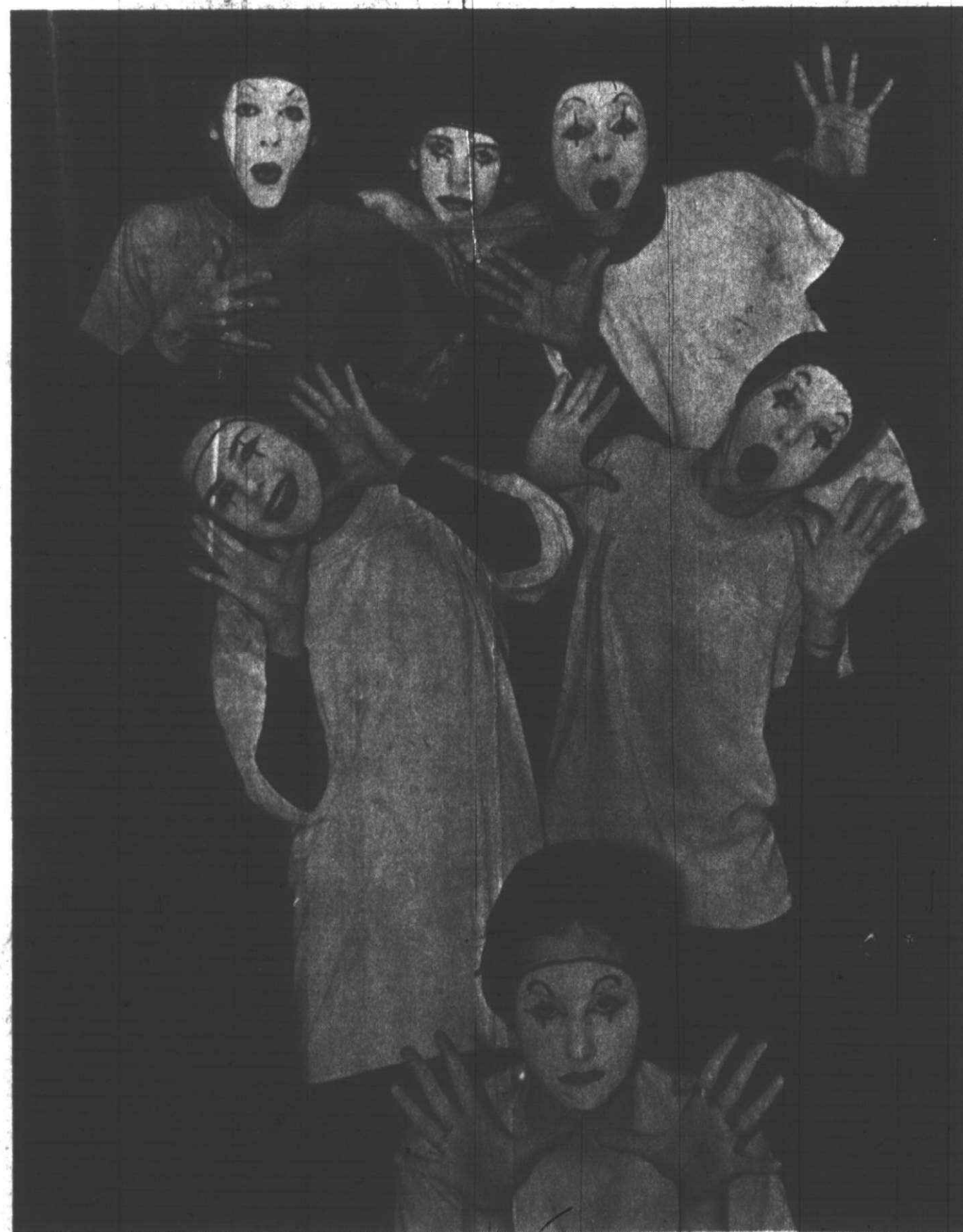
George Kolb, president of Hines Park Lincoln-Mercury, 40601 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth, said sales at his dealership have jumped 100 per cent since the rebate plan was instituted, while traffic has increased 400 per cent.

"Immediately after the rebate program was announced Jan. 16, we began to get all kinds of inquiries," Kolb said. "Traffic since then has just been unbelievable. In general, this thing's been great."

"It seems to have instilled enough confidence that people are letting loose money to buy models not covered by rebate."

Kolb said sales at his dealership were down "dramatically" over fall

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# 2nd Dems gear for Esch defeat; state party backs public strikes

"We're going to put the spears away," said Don Poirier, new chairman of the 2nd Congressional District Democratic organization as Michigan

Democrats closed one of their most placid conventions in years.

Poirier, 39, had the only contest as 2nd District delegates elected a new slate of officers in caucus at the state convention. He defeated Bob Kuebler of Ypsilanti 89-66.

Poirier, assistant controller of Michigan Gas Utilities in private life, comes from Monroe, a section of the 2nd that so far hasn't brought forth a top leader or top candidate in the 2nd, dominated by Livonia and Ann Arbor.

"I WANT TO start to put a district organization together to elect a congressman, and I've had promises of support from all over the district," Poirier said.

He allowed there are some internal problems in the sprawling district, whose seat in Congress was won last

year for the fifth time by Republican Marvin Esch. "Monroe has a rapport with Wayne County that it doesn't have with Washtenaw," Poirier said, "and even that rapport isn't total. We need to get rid of the air of distrust. And this has been the best state convention in years."

Even as he chatted on the convention floor in Detroit's Cobo Hall, the gavel was banging—90 minutes early—to end the party's most harmonious state convention in the memory of most delegates.

Not that there was a lot to argue about: The only major item of business for a winter convention, now that all state offices are elected on the No-

vember ballot, is election of a state chairman, and incumbent Morley Winograd, 32, of Troy, had it wrapped up.

Also elected to state party posts were Olivia (Libby) Maynard, first vice chairperson; Kenneth Hylton, second vice chairperson; Stuart Hertzberg, treasurer; Grace Hampton, recording secretary; and Rose DiPonio, corresponding secretary.

EVEN RESOLUTIONS, over which Democrats usually like to squabble, especially on ideological grounds, presented few problems.

Delegates dumped a proposed resolution calling on the Legislature to "find a solution to the problem of contract disputes in the educational field" and substituted one declaring "both public and private employees should have the right to strike."

Another called for amending Michigan's primary election law to require party registration for voters in a primary. Democrats have been unhappy with the open primary since Republicans in 1972 crossed over in droves to give Alabama's George C. Wallace a majority in the presidential primary.

THE 2ND DISTRICT caucus, after picking Poirier chairman, also selected these officers:

Shirley Johnson of Ypsilanti, first vice chairperson; Barbara Johnson of Livonia, second vice chairperson; Dave Bernstein of Monroe, third vice chairperson; Martha Adkins of Ypsilanti, corresponding secretary; Ann Tavolacci of Livonia, recording secretary; and Ted Preston of Livonia, treasurer.

Seven delegates to the Democratic State Central Committee, governing body of the party between elections, include: Sid Diamond and Phyllis (Pat) Whitton of Livonia; Gregg Keys and Anne Poirier of Monroe; Tom Murray and Richard C. Bailey of Ann Arbor, and Ethel Howard of Ypsilanti.

## How vets can apply for bonus

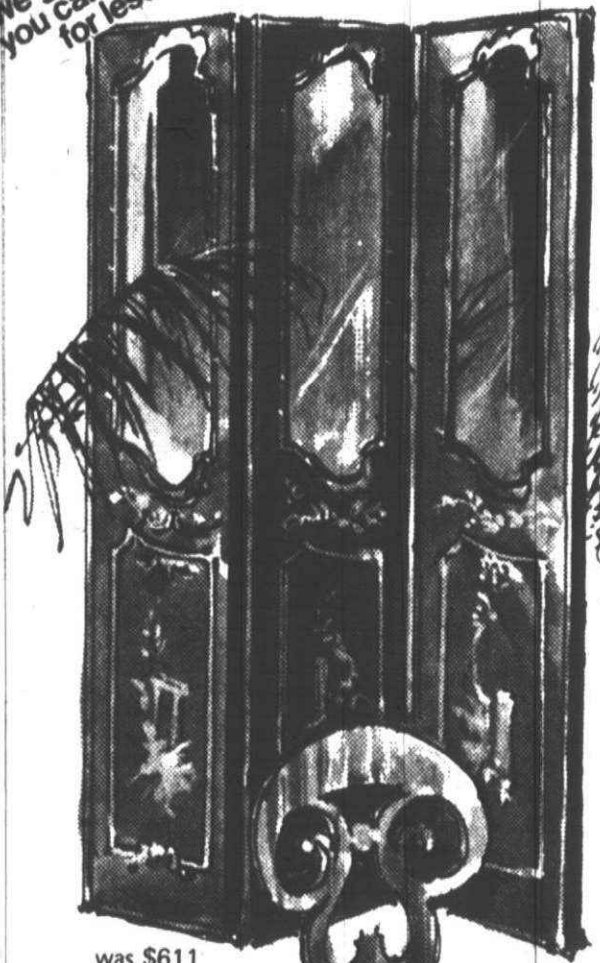

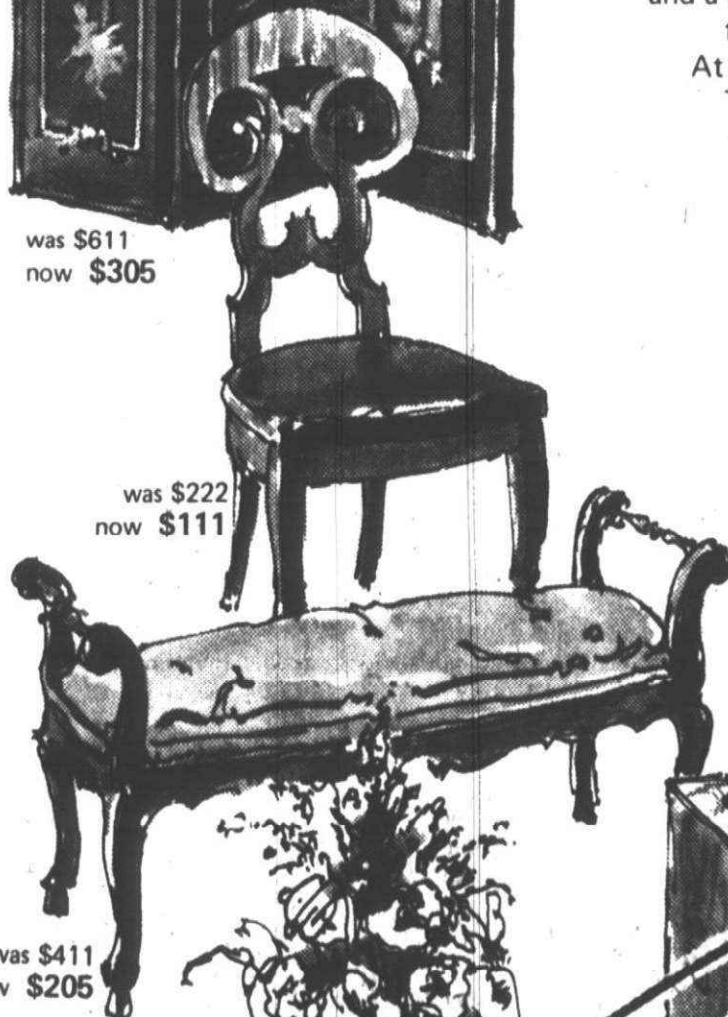

Red Cross is also prepared to counsel veterans about other benefits they may be eligible for.

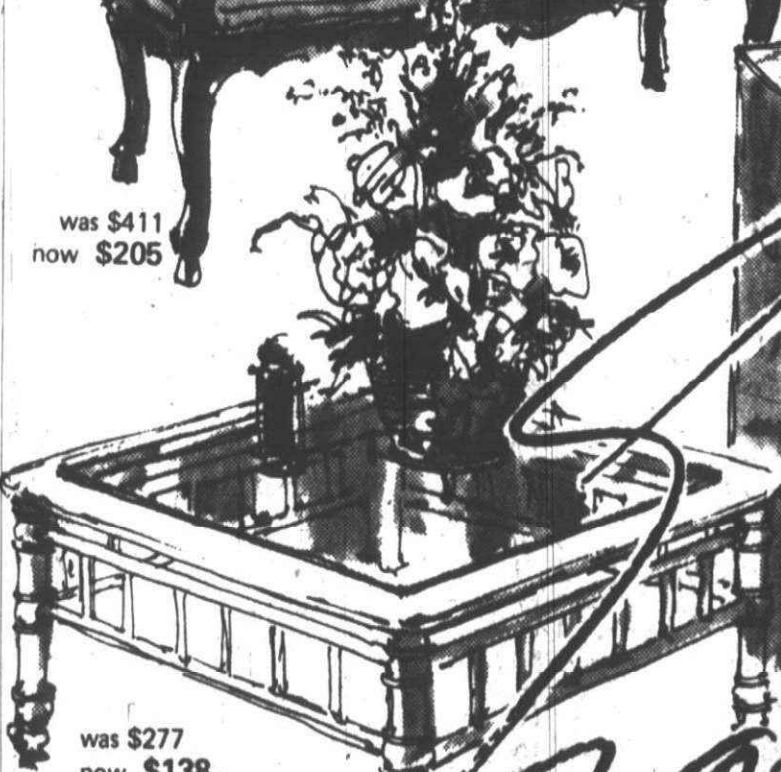

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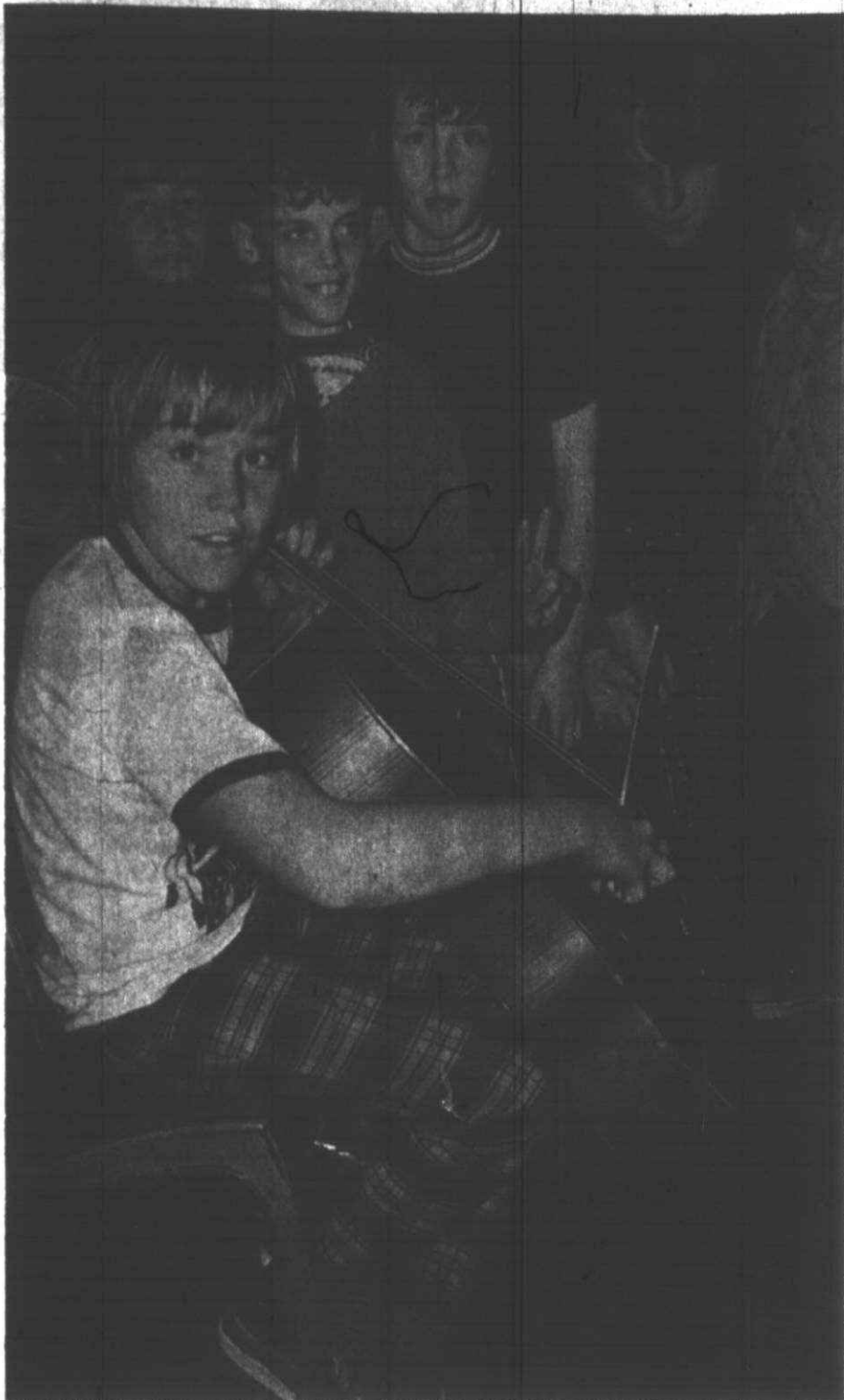

## Plymouth Heights readies sixth charter

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—Township residents will rally at the polls Aug. 3, 1976, to approve or deny the sixth charter for the City of Plymouth Heights submitted in 15 years.

A nine-member charter commission, elected as the township's sixth in the November general election, now proofreading the typed document that could transform Plymouth Township into the City of Plymouth Heights, and provide improved services for a higher tax rate.

Like charters submitted in the past, the new charter provides for a strong mayor system of government and an elected clerk and treasurer, according to charter commission chairman Robert Richardson.

THE CITY of Plymouth Heights would employ a seven-member city council under the charter and provide the services of a fire department, police department, public health department, department of public works, department of parks and recreation, department of building and engineering and a department of law, Richardson said.

Township residents would benefit from the expanded city services of a new police department and receive more police protection than currently offered by the Wayne County Sheriff Department.

The city's public health department would take over the inspection functions of the Wayne County Health Department, Richardson said, and a new department of parks and recreation would maintain the city's parks and recreation areas. Current functions of the township's DPW, department of building and engineering and department of law would expand under the new charter.

Although township residents would receive more services under the city form of government, those services would mean extra tax dollars.

THE NEW CITY charter limits the tax levy that can be imposed without an election to 20 mills (\$20 per \$1,000 of state equalized property value).

A township, on the other hand, is constitutionally limited to a one-mill tax levy without the vote of the people. Plymouth Township, Richardson said, currently levies 3.75 mills.

The Plymouth Heights City Council would decide how many of those 20 mills would be levied and what services, such as garbage pickup and snow removal, would be offered, Richardson noted.

"We would hope the council would not lap up all the mills, unless they were needed," Richardson said. "Services offered would depend on how far the councilmen and people would want to go. There are many areas of service you hear all kinds of complaints on now."

The current township tax burden could jump from \$3.75 to \$20 per \$1,000 of state equalized value, an annual increase of \$243.75 for a \$30,000 home.

The charter provides for a strong mayor form of government, Richardson explained, because charter commission members believe a powerful mayor would lead a more efficient city government.

Under the charter, the mayor would appoint administrative heads of city departments with the approval of the council, Richardson said. The mayor would exercise veto power over council decisions.

THE ELECTED mayor would be subject to recall proceedings at all times, however.

"We feel the strong mayor form of

government has been the intention all along," Richardson said. "We feel it's much more efficient when you have a strong leader. I just feel that when you have a council and mayor and city manager, duties are distributed too widely."

Charter commission members decided to provide for a seven-member city council in the new charter, Richardson said, after discussing the possibility of a smaller council membership.

"We talked about this a great deal," he said. "We felt with the current growth of population a seven-member council would give better representation."

Three city council members would be elected to three-year terms, said Richardson while the remaining four

would hold two-year seats. Councilmen receiving the most votes in the first election would win the four-year posts.

"That way you never come up with a whole new council," he said. "Limiting it to two-year terms really isn't conducive to good government."

A NEW FEATURE of the proposed city charter gives voters the power to elect the president and president pro tem of the council, Richardson said. While previous charters gave city council members the power to elect their own officers, councilmen who gather the most votes in an election would attain officer positions under the new charter.

"We feel this is more in keeping with the wishes of the electorate," he said.

Also new in the charter is the abolition of constables.

"We feel you don't need constables with an adequate police department," Richardson said. "We feel an adequate police department can handle everything."

"In some areas, constables are quite active," he added. "Constables probably sprang up years ago when you had a rural community far from the county seat."

ANOTHER FEATURE of the charter lacking in previous documents is the establishment of a five-member compensation board, empowered to recommend salaries of elected offi-

## City annexation bid delayed

The decision on whether the 30-acre Burroughs parking lot on Plymouth Road will become part of the city may not be made for another six or seven months.

That was the opinion expressed by State Boundary Commission Secretary Jim Hyde last week.

A backlog of cases, some dating back three years, will be the chief cause for the delay in a ruling, Hyde said. The commission will try, over

the next six months, to bring that backlog up to date, leaving a backlog of only about a year on commission decisions.

At a public hearing in October, representatives of the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township presented arguments pro and con on the proposed annexation. At that time, it was thought a decision would be handed down just after the first of the year.

According to Hyde, the earliest the

commission could meet to adjudicate the annexation would be in "late May." Following that it would take at least one month, according to Hyde, to have a formal decision drafted and approved by the commission.

Hyde added that a more "realistic" date for a decision would be "early fall."

Following the Oct. 22 public hearing, the city filed supplemental information with the boundary commission, responding to some points raised at the hearing.

The city also requested the boundary commission to reconsider an earlier denial to hear arguments on the annexation of property across Plymouth Road, the site of the Hillside Inn.

The commission had earlier refused to consider that proposal because of a technical error in the filing of the annexation proposal, according to Plymouth City Manager Fred Yockey.

The city argues that if the Burroughs annexation is approved, the Hillside property would be located on an island of township property, completely surrounded by the city.

Yockey said that if the boundary commission looks favorably on the supplemental material, the commission may call for another public hearing on the matter. If so, the decision would be delayed even further.

Township officials preferred not to comment on the added information filed by the city after the hearing.

"There's really nothing we can do now," noted Township Clerk Helen Richardson. "We're in limbo until the boundary commission acts. We have acted in the best interests of the township residents to this point and anything we say now isn't important. It's a dead issue."

cial to the city council. The mayor would appoint compensation board members prior to each election, Richardson said, and recommendations would be subject to council approval.

"We feel this takes the burden of setting their own salaries off the council members," he explained.

In addition, the new charter changes former charter provisions for civil service commission appointments. Under the new charter, the mayor will appoint one member to the civil service commission, and municipal employees will appoint another. The two appointed commission members will appoint a third.

Under previous charters, the mayor appointed one member, while municipi-

pal employees appointed two. The new arrangement will provide for a more impartial civil service commission, Richardson maintains.

"I think it's a real good charter," Richardson added. "The provisions are all good and strong. We've had some real good charter commission members, and I think they deserve a lot of credit."

The new charter should be on Gov. William Milliken's desk for legal scrutiny by the first week in February, Richardson said.

Candidates for mayor, treasurer, clerk and council will appear on the August 1976 ballot along with the charter question.

## Ford knocks Ford priorities

WESTLAND—U. S. Rep. William D. Ford (D-Taylor), whose district includes Westland, Garden City and Canton has introduced legislation blocking two of President Gerald Ford's proposals, which call for increases in the cost of food stamps and petroleum import fees.

Accusing the president of having his "priorities badly mixed," Ford noted senior citizens and unemployed workers are dependent on food stamps for survival.

"When the president announced his plan to increase food stamp costs," Ford said, "he predicted recipients would have to pay 'slightly more' for the stamps. The facts are, however, that 95 per cent of those Americans using food stamps will pay 30 per cent more, causing many of them to drop out of the program altogether."

"SOME OF THE poorest recipients, who are now able to budget five per cent of their meager incomes for food, would have a 500 per cent increase in their food budgets."

Ford also took a verbal slap at the President for requesting more aid for South Vietnam.

"The president in one breath has asked Congress for \$300 million in extra aid for South Vietnam, and in the next breath wants to cut \$650 million from the food stamp program for retired, unemployed and underprivileged Americans."

"Either the President has his priorities badly mixed, or he is completely unaware that millions of retirees, unemployed and poor Americans need reasonable priced food stamps to survive in our country today."

Ford was joined by members of the House Ways and Means Committee in co-sponsoring the legislation which would block petroleum import fees and would also repeal any interim action taken by the President to levy petroleum tariffs.

According to the President's plan, an import tax of \$3 would be placed on each barrel of petroleum, netting the federal government \$15 billion for the three month period.

Ford contends import fees would add up to \$64 billion in higher prices to consumers for electricity and for agricultural products.

IN FORD'S estimation, the President's action has resulted in "a battle line between the administration and Congress over the fair and effective

means of battling the major depression which threatens the nation."

Ford contends the administration would place an unfair burden on who can afford it the least.

"A major increase in the cost of living is simply not tolerable for Americans who are already caught in the vice of inflation," Ford said.

Instead, Ford maintained, gasoline consumption should be reduced without resorting to higher prices.

"We should maintain and strictly enforce the 55 mph speed limit; close filling stations on Sunday and establish a computerized allocation system to make certain sufficient gasoline and fuel oil are available for all sections of the country."

"As a last resort, we can turn to rationing. I do not want to take this step, but it is certainly preferable to making driving a rich man's privilege and adding to the already crushing burden of inflation."

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# Rebates spur auto buyers

and early winter forecasts, before the rebate plan was instituted.

CLARENCE A. DuCHARME, president of Fiesta Motors, an AMC dealership at 1205 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth, heaped more praise on the rebate idea.

"In four days we did more business than in the previous 20," DuCharme said, adding that rebates have spurred sales at his dealership about 300 per cent. "I can't say enough good about it. It's brought a tremendous amount of traffic and more shoppers than we've experienced in a long time."

"The important thing is the traffic," DuCharme added. "This rebate thing has produced the traffic, and traffic produces sales."

AMC is offering \$200 rebates on 1975 Hornets and Gremlins, \$400 rebates on the Hornet X and the Hornet Sportabout with deluxe and touring packages, a \$300 rebate on the Matador Coupe and a \$600 rebate on the Matador Cassini.

AMC scrapped its free second-year guarantee, when it adopted the rebate plan, DuCharme said. The second year guarantee is now available for an additional charge of \$99.

DuCharme said sales at his dealership were down about 50 per cent over last year before the rebate plan was instituted. He attributes the flurry in sales to renewed customer confidence.

"I think people are excited and have a new air of confidence," he said. "They think this is going to get the ball rolling again. You can feel it when they go into the showroom. There are people who are laid off—I'm not an ostrich with my head in a hole. But the people who are working have money."

THE SALES at Colony Chrysler Plymouth, 111 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth, is much the same.

"It's super," owner Dominic Marino said of Chrysler's rebate plan. "We've seen more business in the past month than we've seen in the past eight months. Traffic is tremendous."

Sales since the rebate plan was instituted jumped 110 per cent over November, Marino said, when sales were down 13 per cent over previous months.

Chrysler's rebate plan differs from other auto companies as the rebate umbrella covers different sets of cars each week.

In the Plymouth line of cars, Chrysler this week is offering \$200 rebates on Satellites and Furs and additional \$100 rebates if customers trade in 1971 or 1972 Torinos or Chevelles.

General Motors is offering \$200 rebates on Vegas and Novas and \$500 rebates on Monzas in its Chevrolet line of cars.

"It's the little shot in the arm we all needed," said Lou LaRiche, owner of Lou LaRiche Chevrolet, 40875 Plymouth Road, Plymouth. "People

are buying other models as well as those on rebate."

LaRiche said sales at his dealership have jumped 100 per cent, since the rebate plan was implemented.

"Sales were terrible before," he said. "We were headed toward our worse January in years."

IN ITS PONTIAC line, GM is offering \$200 rebates on 1975 Astres and Venturas.

Joseph Wallace, sales manager of Bruce Craig Pontiac, Inc., said the rebate plan has spurred large car sales at his dealership, but few customers are purchasing the small Astres and Venturas.

"It has built floor traffic," Wallace said, "but very few people are buying small cars. People come in and look at the small cars, and turn around and buy the big ones."

"I think many people were waiting for something like this to happen," Wallace added. "I believe the rebates will stir auto sales."

But will sales continue at their quickened rate, when rebates are removed on March 1?

"That's a good question," said LaRiche of Chevrolet sales. "I think it's going to be different when they pull the rebates off. I think people may pull back again."

DuCharme is more optimistic, "particularly if there's good news in the paper."

"These sour headlines hit everyone and begin to affect the economy," DuCharme said. "We want good news, but, of course, not lies in the paper. We don't want any more reports of lay-offs. We want reports of people going back to work."

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## Plymouth Schools sell site for road

PLYMOUTH—New or widened roads will be built on part of one school site and take up all of a second.

The Plymouth Community Schools approved the sale of the two parcels of property to the state and county road commissions which will return about \$45,000 to the district.

Lying along the route of the new I-696 expressway, school site No. 2 on Ridge Road, south of Five Mile has been sold to the Michigan State Highway Commission. Purchase price on the property was set at \$60,600.

The school district had purchased the 10-acre parcel in 1958 for about \$20,000. Funds from the sale will be returned to building and site accounts and cannot be used for instructional purposes.

The second sale involved 27 feet of frontage at the Tanger school property on Five Mile, for road widening in front of the school.

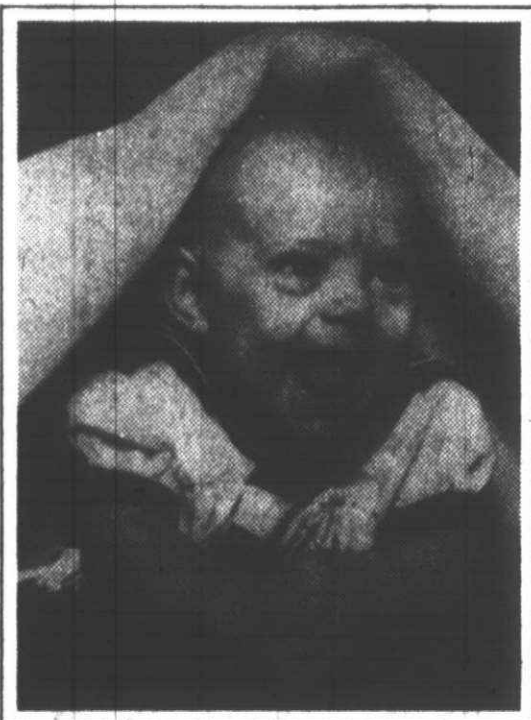
Assistant supt. for business Ray Hoedel noted the road will be widened to five lanes in front of the school, but that just east of the property, the road will remain a two-lane thoroughfare. Students will cross Five Mile at this point, Hoedel said, to ensure a safer crossing for students.

Hoedel said the widening would also make access to the school safer for buses, with a left turn lane available in front of the school.

Purchase price by the Wayne County Road Commission was \$5,750 and, like the other funds, this money will be returned to building and site accounts.

"I am very happy with my assignment to St. Kenneth's," said Father Lombardini. "The parish has approximately 456 families and I'm anxious to get to know them."

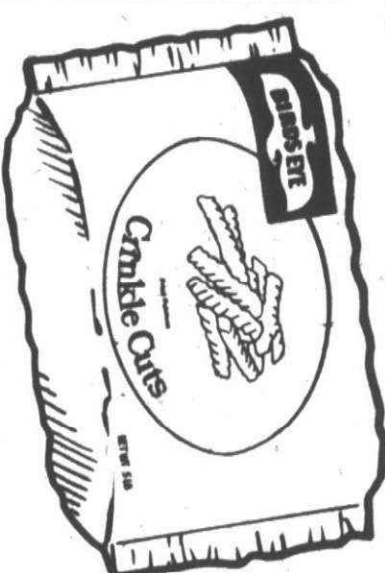

Dr. Kubler-Ross says, "It is hoped that it will encourage others not to shy away from the 'hopelessly' sick but to get closer to them, as they can help them much during their final

hours. The few who can do this will also discover that it will be a mutually gratifying experience and they will learn much about the functioning of the human mind, the unique human aspects of our existence, and will emerge from it enriched and perhaps with fewer anxieties about their own finality."

Berg concluded the evening dinner speeches by saying, "I hope this starts a tradition and is the first of many such annual dinners."



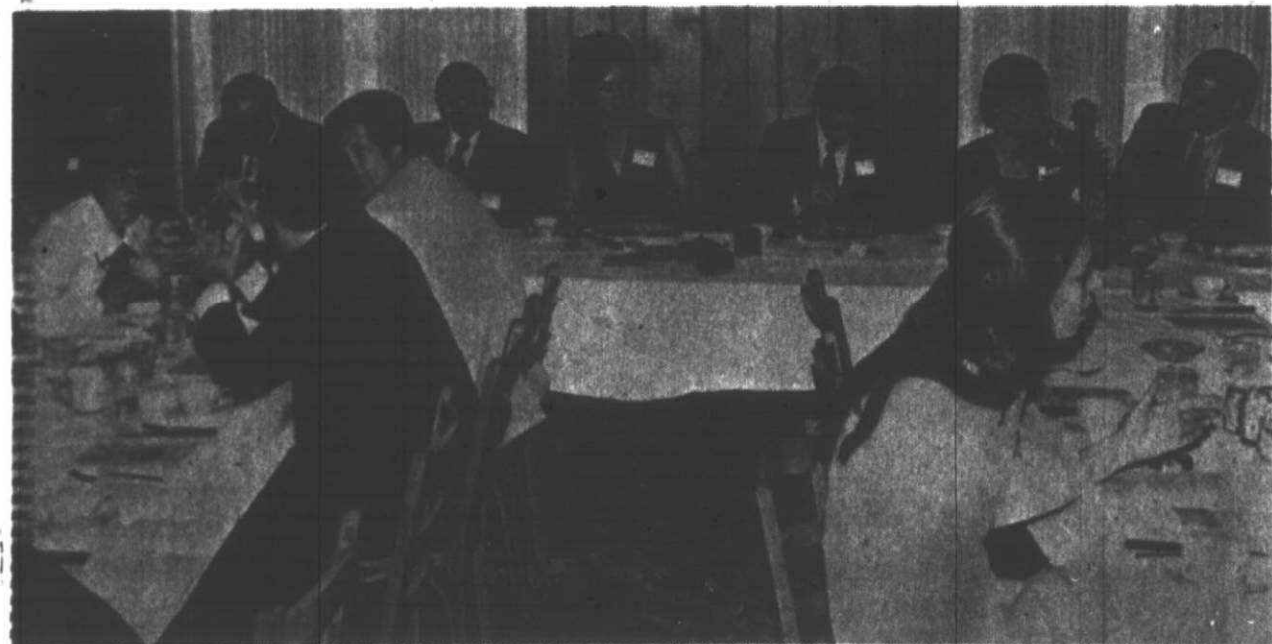

# Any male chauvinists in the house? SC trustee claims there are

LIVONIA—The Battle of the Sexes was enjoined briefly, but vehemently, at perhaps one of the most unlikely battlegrounds Jan. 22.

Unidentified male members of the Schoolcraft Board of Trustees were accused by one of the board's two female trustees of being "male chauvinists."

"I know who are the chauvinists here. I think we all do," said Trustee Rodina Raymond.

The remark came during board discussion of the qualifications of the newly appointed director of community services, Mrs. Jean Christensen.

Mrs. Christensen was hired Dec. 16

to replace Nancy Dufour, who left to take another job.

The National Organization for Woman (NOW) objected to hiring Mrs. Christensen because she allegedly said part of her office—the Women's Resource Center—would not be a "front" for NOW.

Mrs. Christensen's duties include recruiting, training and supervising the center's volunteer staff to help meet the educational and life-style needs of women.

NOW, which is active in the movement for greater rights for women, was concerned it might be barred from having a voice in resource center activities.

Sylvia Vukmirevich, chairperson of

NOW's Education Task Force, told John LaRue, chairman of the Board of Trustees, the college "had not hired the most qualified applicant for the job."

Mrs. Raymond, in a position paper submitted to the board, questioned whether the most qualified person was in fact hired to the women's post.

Dr. C. Nelson Grote, Schoolcraft College president, said Mrs. Christensen was chosen from among 118 candidates for the job.

Grote said Mrs. Christensen was qualified and well received, although she has been at her new job just a month.

"We have to give her a chance," said Grote.

He said Mrs. Christensen recently has become involved with NOW.

The controversy was largely confined to a minor political struggle among NOW members and the community service director until Trustee Arch Vallier argued that the appointment was "none of their darn business," referring to NOW.

Vallier prompted a remark by Mrs. Raymond, who said she was "philosophically in accord with NOW."

Mrs. Raymond added: "While there are some male trustees who believe women are equals, some are chauvinists. And, if the shoe fits, wear it."

## Livonia bank lowers interest for car loans

Manufacturers Bank of Livonia is offering new car loans at reduced rates from now to March 1.

The lower rates is an additional incentive to help boost auto sales in the Detroit market, explains Charles G. Bell, president and chief executive officer of the bank headquartered at 3740 Five Mile, Livonia.

The interest rate will be reduced on a 36 month contract from an annual percentage rate of 11.08 to 9.31 per cent and will result in savings to the buyer ranging from \$90 to \$150.

On an average auto loan of \$3,555 for 36 months, says Bell, the net rate will save the buyer \$105.12.

The reduced rate will apply to any new car, '74 and '75 models, financed through the bank for terms up to 36 months. It will apply to loans made directly with the bank or indirectly through the dealer.

The purchaser, however, must be approved for credit and must have a minimum 25 per cent downpayment.

## Dining-out prices are shocking

It's a good thing Rip Van Winkle awoke when he did. Had he awakened today and ended his 20-year slumber in time for dinner, he would have been shocked into another long sleep by the prices he'd see on the menus in our leading eating establishments.

No one knows the exact date when the legendary Rip went to sleep, but it is a certainty that the cost of food in the emporiums of his time was a lot less than it is today.

Even if it were only 40 years ago that he dozed off, the prices then were far below what one has to pay for a not too lavish meal in today's spiraling economy.

ONE OF THE MOST famous restaurants in the country 40 years ago was Jack Dempsey's at the corner of Eighth Avenue and 50th Street in New York City. It was across from Madison Square Garden—the seat of the boxing industry. And no trip there was complete without a visit to

see the old "Mannassa Mauler," who still is the most popular of all heavyweight champions.

It is just four decades ago that Joe Louis, the Brown Bomber, went East for the first time as a professional fighter to meet Primo Carnera, the Ambling Alp. One of the first stops the accompanying sports writers made was at Dempsey's for an evening meal.

To be exact, it was June 1935, and would you believe it, the special for that day was a salad with 10 different health ingredients for 35 cents!

HERE ARE JUST a few of the items on the menu that day, and they are almost unbelievable: broiled young lobster, \$1.50; tenderloin steak, \$1.85; whole young guinea hen, \$1.75; prime ribs of beef, \$1.25; and roast young duckling, \$1.65.

Even at those figures the Old Champ was criticized as a gouger. As one of the writers' commented, "Don't tell me he has lost his punch—not with prices like that."

Things are a great deal different today. If Old

Rip were to awaken and walk into Vargo's in Livonia he'd be more than startled to find that one of the cheapest meals on the gourmet menu would be Lake Superior white fish at \$6.25. And if he wanted a steak it would be a filet mignon at \$8.75. Or if he yearned for a seafood platter, it would be available at \$12.95. Even a couple of lamb chops would set him back \$7.75.

STROLLING OVER to Taylor's in Livonia, Rip would find that a porterhouse steak would cost him \$7.50 and even chopped sirloin (hamburger) would be tagged at \$4.75, with an extra charge for the onions.

Should Old Rip look for some old Bavarian favorites he could find them at Huck's in Redford Township. Here a steak would cost him \$8.50, and the old favorite of pig hocks and sauerkraut could be had for \$6.

By chance he had dropped into the Mayflower Hotel in Plymouth on New Year's Eve he'd have found only five entrees on the menu and the least

expensive of these was crabmeat-stuffed fillet of flounder at \$6.50. Anything else would have been \$7.50.

Had he wandered into the Mayflower Steak House, instead, he'd have found the smallest steak (without all the trimmings) would have cost him \$3.95 and the New York Strip, \$4.95.

HAD HE changed his mind and decided to ring out the old year and ring in the new at the Hillside Inn, he could have enjoyed broiled lobster tidbits at \$9.50, or deep-fried gulfstream shrimp at \$7.25.

And if he had heard the rumor that in this day and age we were close to paying \$10 for steaks, he would have found we are just a nickel short, with New York strips, and tenderloins pegged at \$9.95 each.

With news like that, can there be any doubt Old Rip would be shocked and grumble off to another slumber lasting, perhaps, more than 20 years?

## New county chairman lists goals for board

The new chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, Roscoe L. Bobo, lists senior citizen housing, community health centers, improved juvenile programs and new jail facilities as goals for an affirmative action program for the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Bobo, a Democrat from Ecorse, is the first black member ever elected chairman of the county board of commissioners since its inception as an elected board in 1969.

BOBO, 62, is a former Ecorse councilman and the retired assistant police chief of that city. He is starting his third two-year term on the county board.

Commissioner John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights), who is serving his second term, was elected vice-chairman.

Bobo, who was vice-chairman last year, replaces Robert FitzPatrick who resigned from the board to run unsuccessfully for U.S. Congress in the 17th District.

In assessing 1975, Bobo warned that the current recession will curtail county revenues. He said he will call an early meeting with department heads to stress the need for economy and efficiency.

BOBO DECLARED he would give priority consideration to seven programs.

"My first action as chairman will be to review all our manpower programs to ensure every possible cent of federal money that can be used to put persons to work is brought into Wayne County and that these funds are translated into paychecks for the

unemployed as quickly as possible."

The county government, which administers manpower programs outside the City of Detroit, has been allocated \$5.2 million in federal funds for public service jobs in recent weeks. Some of the money will be passed on to local communities.

The Wayne County Juvenile Facilities Network program to prevent and reduce delinquency must be improved and expanded, Bobo said.

Health centers, operated by Wayne County General Hospital, he continued, should be established in areas where there are persons, such as invalids and senior citizens, who don't have or cannot afford transportation to the hospital.

Bobo said he would request an early meeting with leaders of the Michigan Legislature to discuss the county's

request for a \$30 million state loan to finance additional jail facilities.

BOBO URGED the board of commissioners to adopt soon his resolution to establish a county housing commission to obtain federal funds for senior citizen housing.

"Many of our senior citizens are living in substandard housing, amidst deplorable health and safety conditions,"

Bobo proposed that Detroit and Wayne County set up a joint capital improvements committee to plan construction of new courts building and other needed public facilities.

He promised to press for improvement of the county civil service system to eliminate discrimination and for adoption of an affirmative action program for hiring minorities.

"Wayne County, the third largest county in the U.S., does not yet have a coherent and effective affirmative action program. This can no longer be tolerated by this board of commissioners."

Bobo won the chairmanship on the first ballot with 21 votes. The only other nominee, Commissioner Ervin A. Steiner, Jr. (R-Grosse Pointe Farms), got two votes. There were four abstentions.

Barr received 23 votes to two for his only opponent, Commissioner Mary E. Dumas (R-Livonia). There were two abstentions.

Mrs. Dumas and Steiner, the only Republican board members, nominated and voted for each other for the two posts.

## Area commissioners assigned committees

Richard Manning, Mary Dumas and Tom Taylor have received their committee appointments from the new chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, Roscoe L. Bobo.

Bobo (D-Ecorse) has named Manning (D-Redford) as chairman of the general government committee. Mrs. Dumas (R-Livonia) has been appointed vice chairman of that committee.

Taylor (D-Westland), whose district includes Garden City, has been named a member of the public works

committee along with Royce E. Smith (D-Belleville) whose district includes Plymouth area and Canton Township.

Receiving the most important committee assignment is Samuel A. Turner (D-Detroit) who was named chairman of the ways and means committee. Taylor was designated vice chairman of this committee. This is a move up for Taylor, a former Westland policeman, who was among those in the running for board chairman this year.

The appointments are for one-year terms, says Bobo, and were made with advice from John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights) who has been elected vice chairman of the board of commissioners.

John Lesinski (D-Dearborn) kept his chairmanship of the public works committee. Named vice-chairman was Edgar Harris (D-Taylor).

Edward K. Michalski (D-Detroit) and William G. Suzore (D-Lincoln Park) were appointed chairman and

vice chairman respectively of the public safety and judiciary committee. Jarrette Simmons (D-Detroit) was named chairman of the human resources committee.

Of the two Republicans on the 27-member board, Mrs. Dumas was the only one to receive a committee office. The other Republican, Ervin A. Steiner, Jr. of Grosse Pointe was named a member of the human resources committee.

## Esch proposes U.S. tax credit on auto sales

U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has proposed a new incentive to stimulate automobile sales in the U.S.

Esch's proposal would provide a tax credit for anyone purchasing a new car in 1975. The credit would be \$250 for a car that receives at least 15 miles per gallon average between city and road, and \$100 for a car with less mileage per gallon.

If the car is purchased before April 15, the taxpayer would be able to apply the credit against his 1974 taxes. Thus the legislation, if passed, might have an immediate impact on new car sales.

He believes the program would cost about \$2 billion, but adds that "we will spend two or three times that amount in unemployment compensation this year."

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## Flood insurance to be explained

Repercussions of the new Federal Flood Plain Insurance legislation will be explained at a meeting in Southfield Monday, Feb. 3, by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

The meeting, open to the public, will begin at 1:30 p.m. in the parks and recreation building of the Southfield Civic Center, 26000 Evergreen between 10 and 11 Mile Roads in Southfield.

AT THE MEETING, held at the request of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR), representatives of SEMCOG will explain why communities which do not adhere to the new legislation will be ineligible for:

Federally funded flood insurance; federal funds or federally guaranteed

loans for building in flood plains; federal disaster relief funds for flooded areas.

The National Flood Insurance Program is federally subsidized and authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 to protect property owners who had been unable to get affordable coverage through the private insurance industry.

The Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 expanded the available limits of flood insurance coverage and imposed added requirements on property owners and communities.

Among the new requirements are applying for the insurance by July 1, 1975 as a condition of receiving any form of federally related assistance for construction or acquisition of real or personal property.

SOME 106 Michigan communities, about 80 of these in southeast Michigan, have recently been identified by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as flood hazard areas not enrolled in a national flood insurance program.

If those governing bodies don't apply for entry by July 1, their federally guaranteed loans and grants will be jeopardized as well as residents' eligibility for FHA or bank loans on local real estate, mobile homes and in some cases personal property.

Richard S. Watt, hydrologic engineer for the DNR, says the situation is "potentially serious for both residents and communities."

"Anyone dealing with federal money will have to have flood insurance to qualify if they live in a designated flood-prone area," Watt urged citizens in this region to attend the meeting.

Among the speakers who will tell residents how to protect themselves will be Watt and representatives of the HUD flood insurance office and the Insurance Company of North America (INA).

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# Gasoline choice: Pay up or wait in line

The biggest hot potato in American politics these days is the question of what to do to cut the nation's dependence on outside oil supplies by reducing the demand for petroleum products—and who will take responsibility for making the decision.

Unfortunately, the two major proposals so far advanced—increasing the price of gas at the pumps by taxation or restricting the supply by rationing—both penalize folks who live in the suburbs.

Let's consider the advantages and disadvantages of both proposals from a suburban point of view.

ON THE SURFACE, President Ford's proposal to drive down demand for gas by taxing imported crude oil seems fair and sensible. It would not entail the vast bureaucracy that a rationing system would, and it would depend on the mechanisms of the free market to restrict use of gas as its price rises.

But, suburbanites do much, much more driv-

ing than the rest of the population, and hence an increase in gas prices would affect us in the suburbs much, much more than the rest of the country.

Many people live in the suburbs but work in downtown Detroit or elsewhere, and because there is essentially no worthwhile mass transit in this area they are dependent on their car (and expensive gas) to get to work. Even people who live and work in the suburbs are required by the spread-out nature of our community geography to use their car to drive to work or take the kids to school or shop.

The only counter-argument to this suburban

analysis is that, in general, people in the suburbs are richer than people who live downtown or in rural areas, and that to tax by increased gas prices wealthy suburbanites is fair.

THE RATIONING example would not penalize us in the suburbs directly in the pocketbook, but it sure would louse up our ordinary life style.

Almost surely the consequence of rationing would be restricted gas supplies to almost all of us. How many of us could continue our ordinary driving style on only nine gallons a week, as the Administration predicts the results for rationing would be? Not many.

And for suburbanites, no alternate means of transportation are available when gas supplies are restricted.

Hence, on these grounds, rationing seems like the worst possible alternative for us.

THERE IS ONE WAY out of the bind.

If we do not want to accept the progressive tax on suburbanites that an increase in gas taxes would entail, and if we want to maintain some

kind of equity in gas availability that rationing would threaten, it would do well to consider the rationing plan suggested, among others, by Rep. Henry Reuss, newly named chairman of the House Banking Committee.

He would have a series of local boards, which would hold hearings for each recipient of gas rationing cards to determine the extent of normal and necessary driving, and adjust the gas allocation accordingly.

This system would be fair, but clumsy and probably very time consuming. It probably would be open to all kinds of abuses.

Hence, as is so often the case, there is no really perfect answer to the big problems. We can tax gas, and hence disproportionately tax ourselves in the suburbs. We can ration gas, and threaten ourselves with serious curtailment of our ordinary way of life. Or we can set up neighborhood boards, which will result in confusion and delay.

You pay your money (or wait in your line at the pumps) and take your choice.

The young have their stereos on full blast because they like loud music. The older folks turn their radios up because they're hard of hearing.

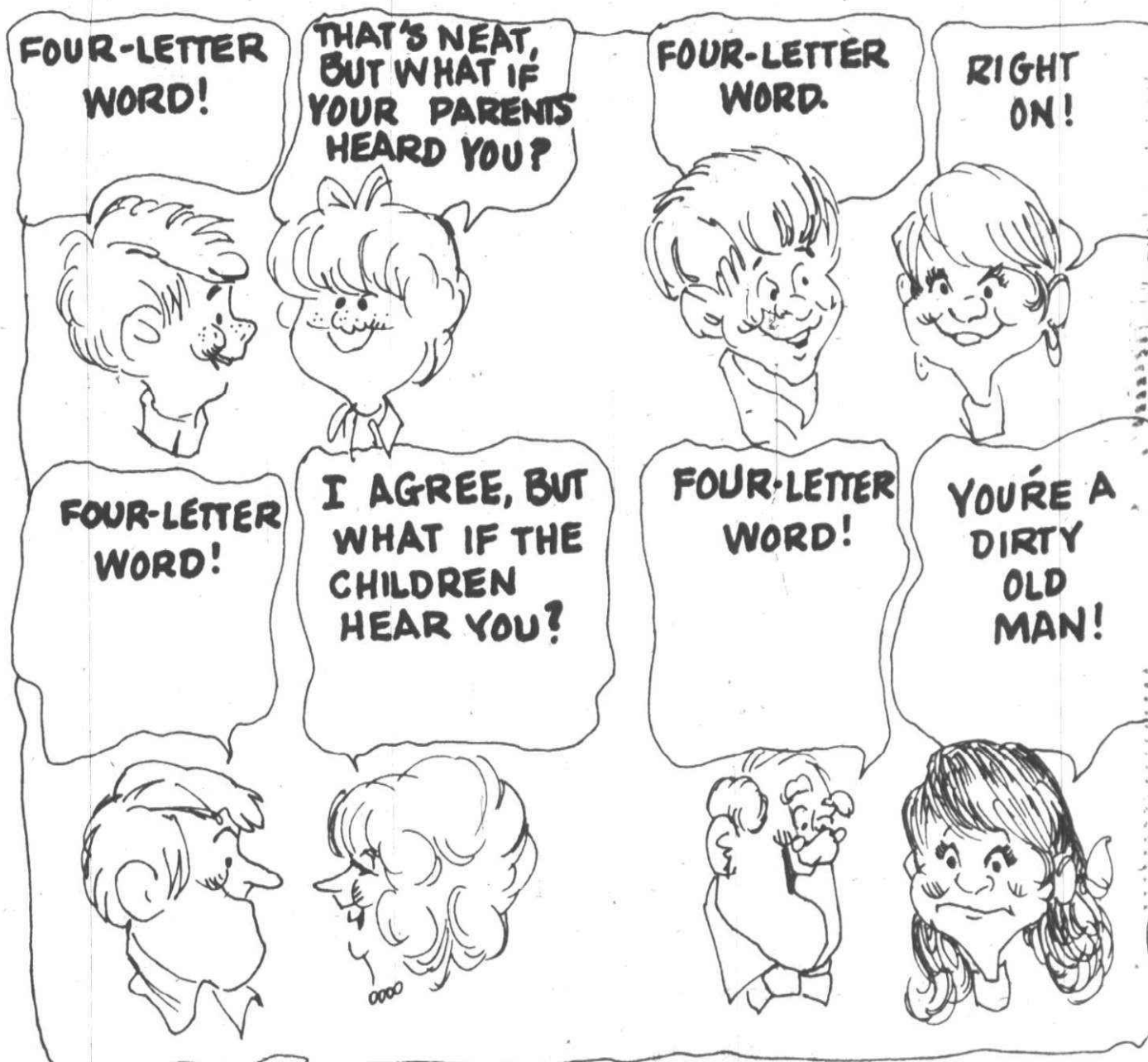
When a college student orates non-stop, he's verbal. His father lectures or sermonizes.

## Malpractice law needed

The bugaboo of malpractice law suits isn't a bugaboo for doctors any more, especially in the states of Michigan and Ohio where recent awards by juries have forced several companies carrying the insurance to drop it or to raise premiums to a point where doctors are seriously considering retiring.

Just one such malpractice suit and a huge award by a jury could wipe out all the savings of a doctor who had been in the profession for 25 or more years.

Thus, at a time when most doctors are thinking of limiting their practices and living a normal life again, they are now faced with the malpractice bugaboo.

IT WAS BROUGHT to the attention of the public in Michigan several months ago when one major insurer let it be known it was dropping that kind of business.

It didn't exactly appreciate the thought of having to raise premiums to a point where doctors couldn't afford to pay or a point where the doctors would have to charge the additional costs back to their patients.

We recently received a letter from the wife of a doctor who spent nine years of his life in colleges getting the knowledge to become an internist. This included four years in medical school, one year of internship, four years of surgical residency and two more years of specialty.

This unnamed internist is in a position where he feels he may have to give up his practice because he can't afford malpractice insurance and he can't afford to continue practicing without the insurance.

His premium six years ago was \$750 and now is being raised to \$18,000 annually. That's quite a hike, regardless of what kind of business a person is in, and when a doctor has to consider spreading that cost back to his patients.... well one can readily see what kind of a problem arises.

WE HAPPEN TO KNOW quite a few doctors, have more than a passing acquaintanceship with a great many who have played a major role in our destiny during the past three years.

We know that most doctors are not reaping fortunes, as many people believe. They are hard

working individuals, doing their best to keep patients healthy and alive. They don't succeed in all cases for the type of disease makes it impossible, but we never ran across a doctor that could be accused of malpractice.

The situation in Michigan is probably as acute as any in the entire United States. This was brought out a few weeks back when the anesthetist in St. Mary Hospital notified the entire staff of doctors that they were considering moving to another state where malpractice suits aren't as common.

Michigan has been hit as hard as any other state and, with California and perhaps Ohio, ranks at the top of the list.

The situation is particularly bad in Ohio, where the insurer can drop a policy without giving the insured advance notice.

The sixth largest insurer in Ohio dropped that bomb on eight doctors at St. Vincent Hospital there. Almost at the same time, another insurer notified a group of doctors covered by a blanket policy that the premium was being boosted from \$48,000 per year to \$360,000.

AT THE PRESENT moment, it is estimated the cost to patients is \$1.50 to \$2 per visit if the doctor is able to find an insurer. If not, then he appears to have two options: to pay the costs of lawsuits and face the possibility of a jury making an award of thousands of dollars for which he would personally be responsible, or give up his practice.

Can you imagine a hospital trying to get along without anesthetists? St. Mary Hospital wouldn't be in that position if its unit decided to go elsewhere, but it would be losing a group that is considered one of the finest in this section of the United States.

And why? Because of the constant threats of malpractice suits. We hope the Michigan Legislature realizes the importance of this situation and does take action to ease and correct it during the present session.

### Mayor of special interests

Isn't it about time that the honeymoon ends for Coleman Young, mayor of Detroit?

For many years the blacks in Detroit have been saying that Detroit's problems could be solved if a black mayor were elected, because he would represent the majority. This generality has put Detroit where it is today.

What Detroit needs is a good administrator, whether he be black or white, because the running of Detroit is a big business.

IN HIS TERM of office, Coleman Young has proven that he is a mayor of special interests, a politician, and a poor administrator.

The latest example is hiring a girl as the temporary head of the law department in Detroit for close to \$40,000 a year. She graduated from law school less than a year ago, flunked the bar exam and has never practiced law.

Prior to that appointment, he put his girl friend on the payroll as head of the Bicentennial celebration at over \$35,000 a year. When the Free Press investigated what was being done by her department the answer came back, "nothing."

One of the first things he did as mayor of Detroit was to put Stress out of business. If you remember, this was the operation of the Detroit police department where plain clothesmen roamed the streets of Detroit, luring street robbers into a trap, arresting them and taking them off the streets.

Since Stress is no longer operational, major street crimes have increased dramatically in the city of Detroit.

We have always said in this paper that the suburbanites owe a duty to the core city to see that it is healthy because there are no fine suburbs if you have a deteriorated core city.

BUT THE MAYOR of Detroit apparently doesn't want suburban help and was even considering the closing of the Detroit Institute of Art because it cost the city of Detroit money to operate and is used primarily by people who live outside of Detroit.

His parochialism and reversed racism has now made Detroit one of the sickest cities in the nation.

We would all like to be positive about Detroit because it has many fine attributes, but the longer Coleman Young remains in office the more difficult it is to try to be positive about the city.

Coleman Young is in office to stay for a long time unless he is recalled by the voters. Obviously, suburbanites have no role in such a recall. Because Coleman Young is black it is doubtful that there would be enough voters in Detroit who would petition for a recall for fear that they would be accused of racism.

Yet, if Young were white, there's a good chance that he would have been booted out of office shortly after his election because of the way he has been running Detroit for his own special group of people, and these are not the black people in general.

He is not helping Detroit and we are sitting helplessly watching the city deteriorate.

## Redford rejoins regional fold

Redford Township has long been the most populous unit with township government in the United States, and in its level of services it is probably one of the most developed, too. Unfortunately, for the last four years, Redford—whose proud residents always refer to it as "The Township"—has sort of let the rest of the world go by in terms of its regional citizenship.

That defect has now happily been corrected by the decision of the township board to rejoin the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. Much credit goes to the new supervisor, Patrick McDonald, whose attitude seems to be one of business as usual rather than small town politics as usual.

Redford Township recognized that SEMCOG is more than a vague, paper-pushing planning agency, although planning is an important function. SEMCOG's staff knows how to help pry

money out of Washington; SEMCOG approves federal grants; SEMCOG will design the regional bus and rapid transit system; SEMCOG will appoint six of the nine members of the transit authority; SEMCOG has solid waste and criminal justice improvement programs.

You can't get the benefits—or squawk about the regional players—unless you buy into the program. Redford Township trustees saw their responsibility and rose to the occasion.

Westland and Garden City need to reconsider their positions in the larger community of southeast Michigan. SEMCOG could benefit from their different points of view. When you fall to be an active participant in the region, it's like being in the State of Michigan and not sending a senator or representative to Lansing. You cripple everyone else and yourself, too.

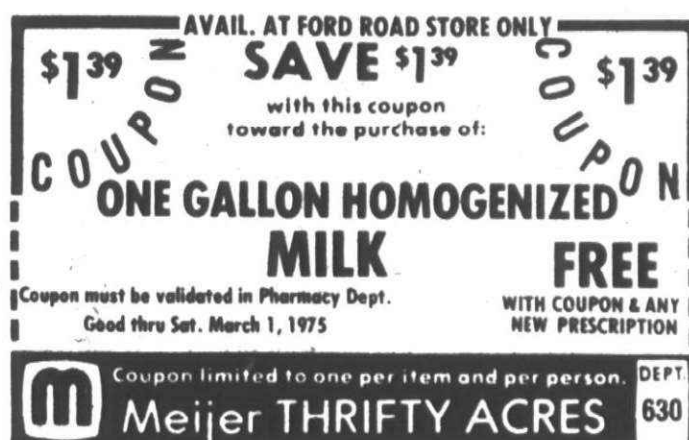
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# Abortion agency drops confusing name

The director of an abortion counseling agency with offices in Livonia and Pontiac has agreed to stop using the words "Planned Parenthood" in connection with her centers' services.

The agreement on the part of Mrs. Betty Eason came just prior to a hearing scheduled in Federal Court in Detroit Jan. 27.

The hearing before Judge James P. Churchill was to have considered a request by Planned Parenthood League, Inc., that Mrs. Eason be enjoined from using the name in connection with her centers.

"She consented last Friday to the request," said her attorney, Robert Goren of Southfield. "She said she's not trying to harm anyone or cause any confusion."

**GOREN EXPLAINED** that Mrs. Eason had used the name Planned Parenthood of Oakland County among other names for offices at 19500 Middle Belt, Livonia, and 140 S. Saginaw, Pontiac.

"The name was approved by the state of Michigan and also by the state of Florida, neither of which had records that show it to be a name that has been patented federally," the attorney added.

"Betty did not believe it to be more than a phrase," he said.

**THE COMPLAINT** in Federal court was brought by Planned Parenthood Federation of America, New York, and the Washtenaw County League for Planned Parenthood in Ann Arbor

as well as Planned Parenthood League, Inc.

David Gaskin, vice chairman of PPL, said requests that Mrs. Eason "cease using our name" had brought no response prior to the court action.

Main considerations in filing the suit, Gaskin said, were the matters of public confusion and financial support.

"Persons seeking assistance from our health organization—which is a well-respected non-profit organization in existence for over 35 years—are likely to be misled and instead treated by Betty Eason," he said.

"And we would not like to see funds intended for the work of PPL to go by mistake to any of Betty Eason's businesses."

**THE LIVONIA CENTER** operated by Mrs. Eason is listed in the telephone directory as "Women's Abortion Advisory Center." Staff members answering the phone use the term "Womancenter", and, if questioned about the full name of the organization, list it as "Women's Advisory Center."

"We counsel women who want to know about having an abortion or may have some doubts about it," the staff member said. "The Planned Parenthood name was just used as another name to be listed. It was a misunderstanding."

The office in Pontiac is listed in the telephone directory as "Midwest Gynecologists."

"It's a doctors' practice," said the staff member in Livonia.

Following the agreement this week, a spokesman for Planned Parenthood, Inc., said Mrs. Eason had stated she would not use the name in any manner.

"We hope this will end some of the confusion between the services she offers and the ones Planned Parenthood offers," the spokesman added.

## Board recommends food stamp change

A resolution by Wayne County Commissioner Arthur M. Carter urging changes in the food stamp program

has been unanimously approved by fellow commissioners.

The Carter resolution urges President Ford to restore the value of the stamps to the level which existed last Dec. 1 "so as to provide adequate food for the needy."

**PROBLEMS** enumerated by Carter include lack of sufficient application centers, restricted use of the department's mobile unit and the fact clients were uncertain regarding required documents.

The resolution states, "overworked food stamp office personnel are often dehumanizing to clients."

It says that post office employees assigned to sell food stamps frequently refer clients back to Social Services because the employees lack sufficient training and information.

Besides urging more personnel in food stamp offices, the resolution urges the state Legislature and Congress to appropriate emergency funds for several purposes.

**ONE IS** unrestricted use of a mobile application center, opening of more application centers, and training and sensitivity sessions for food stamp office personnel.

The resolution called "the latest in a growing crescendo of calls from public bodies" intends to solve some of the major problems which are hampering the enrollment of the growing

numbers of unemployed in the food stamp program.

The resolution notes there are 79,550 households and 236,102 persons in Detroit and the rest of Wayne County who are eligible and in need of food stamps. It also cites a recent survey which estimates there are 100,000 persons with inadequate food in Detroit.

The day after the resolution was passed, Gov. Milliken announced the staff handling food stamp applications in Wayne County would be tripled with some 80 workers added to the 40 now processing applications.

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## Freeway bids OK for Livonia

Low bids for fabrication and delivery of structural steel for six bridges over I-96 in Livonia have been accepted by the Department of State Highways and Transportation.

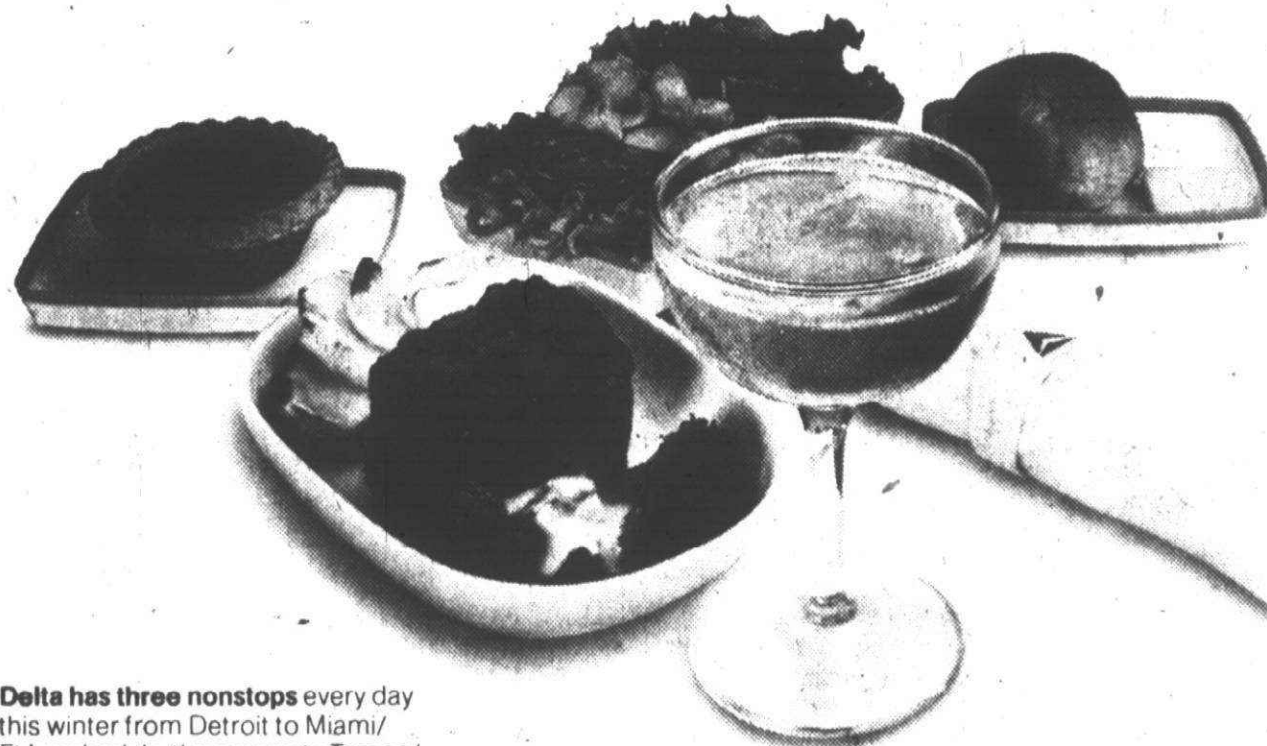
The Livonia bids were among 13 freeway bridge projects approved by the highway department recently.

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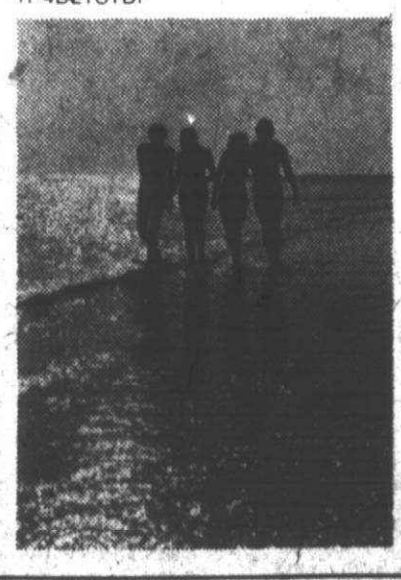
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Rocks maul Trenton, 72-40

Salem cagers gear for Bulldog revenge

The high school basketball schedule finally pits Livonia Bentley against Plymouth Salem again Friday night, and it could be one of the classic battles of the season in this area.

It was a quarter which was marked mainly by Plymouth's loss of 6-8 Jim Ellinghausen for the rest of the game with a slight ankle sprain and by the

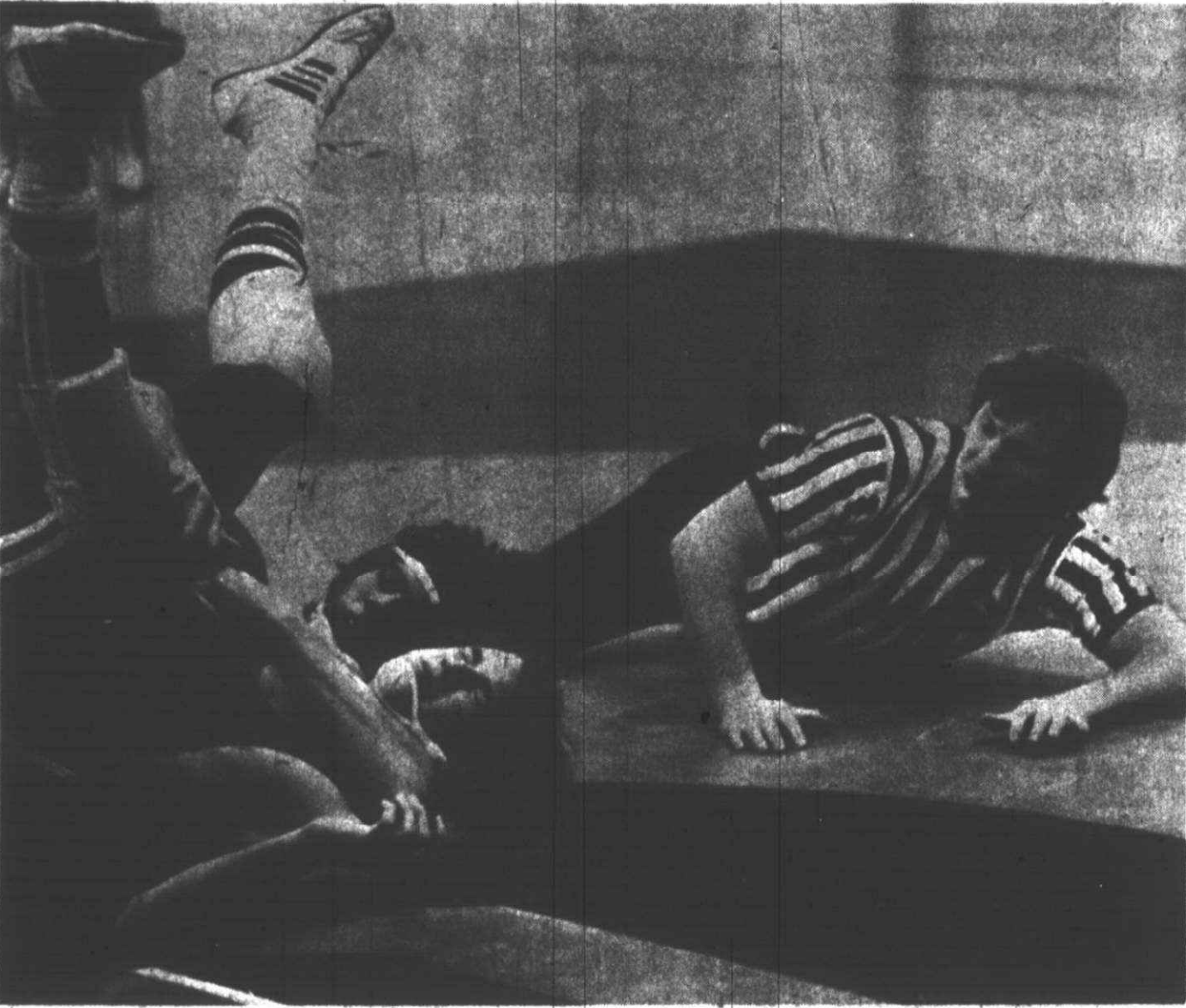
normally accurate Agardy missing four chances in a row from the foul line.

## The Green Thumb

With a world-wide food shortage looking us in the eye, it's good to know that a few public schools are sensible enough to teach students something about growing plants.

Peter J. Wotowiec, supervisor of the horticulture department, Cleveland Public Schools passes along some interesting facts other schools should look into.

Over 21,000 gardeners in the Cleveland schools' youth garden program have completed their reports for the 1974 season.

Production of vegetables alone by the students amounted to over \$622,000.

The Cleveland school garden pro-

gram, originated in 1904, includes tracts located throughout the city where young people maintain individual garden plots. Total space devoted to tract gardens exceeds 35 acres. Those who did not wish to participate in the tract program had the option to maintain their "green thumbs" by enrolling for a home garden.

ALTHOUGH the value of vegetables produced by the students was over \$622,211, we feel that the educational value of gardening is just as important. Gardening remains a field laboratory for pupil development in the areas of environmental sciences, practical mathematics, and just about

every other area taught in schools.

There isn't a subject in high school (or elementary grades) which cannot be taught, based on gardening or nature study. In good times and bad, our total environment continues to be our most cherished resource, and our whole society is committed to preserving and protecting our environment.

We can do this and at the same time, learn to grow much of our own food.

IF YOU WANT to try some dandy new apples, plant the following:

(1) Empire, a wonderful McIntosh type, introduced by the Geneva, N.Y.

experimental station. A fine dessert apple that keeps longer in the refrigerator than the McIntosh. Skin is solid red and covered with a heavy waxy coating (called "bloom"). Tree ripens two weeks later than McIntosh.

(2) Idared, cross between Jonathan and Wagener, has bright red skin and solid flesh. Good keeper. Tart at time of harvest, but it mellows later. Trees bear young and heavy. Originated at Idaho experimental station.

(3) Jonamac, a cross between Jonathan and McIntosh. Has more red color than the McIntosh, and quality is better.

## Bedroom grows from bassinet to full-bed size



CLOSET BABY is a happy baby, especially when its parents have made this area into a charming "alcove" from where there is a natural graduation into the larger room.

A pair of children's rooms has been created by Armstrong designer Louisa Cowan. Each has the adaptability to accommodate a growing youngster, comfort, adequate storage space and decorating ideas anyone can duplicate with very little know-how.

By painting an over-sized closet a warm golden color (deeper than the rest of the room) a cozy, intimate nursery was born.

Parents can coddle their baby in a room of its own, and the infant can make a natural transition into the larger area in a short time.

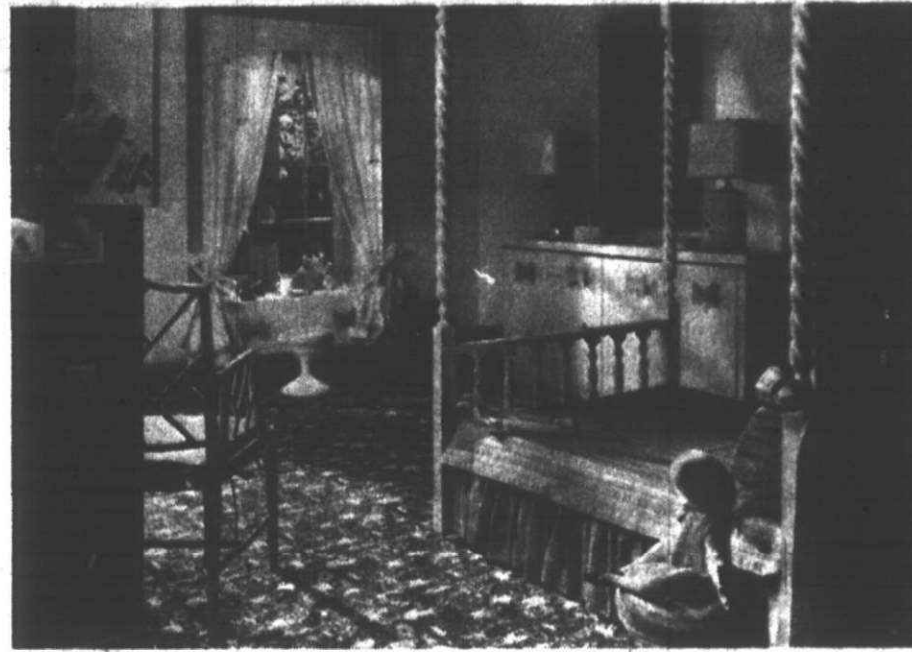
THE FOUR-POSTER room is a great do-it-yourself project. The curtains are white sheets trimmed with pink and white polka-dot seersucker. This

Both the hanging and floor storage chests, and the chair, are unfinished furniture painted white. Knobs are decorated with jigsawed wooden bows attached to a one-inch cube and screwed into place. Later these can be replaced with more sophisticated porcelain knobs.

Because the designer found frogs appeal to little girls, she used frog puppets on the window seat and a frog motif on the mirror. There is even a frog toy bin.

Both rooms feature acoustical tile ceilings and are a cinch to reproduce.

# Gray Rocks Inn -- No.1 ski school resort

After years of being a "rocking chair skier"—the time was now to see how the real skier lives, in his conquest of slope and snow.

And to take on this challenge of actually putting on a pair of ski boots and even a set of skis...it was off to the Laurentian Mountains in Quebec, Canada.

A flight to Montreal was first in order, followed by a 74-mile drive up the Autoroute.

At the conclusion of mile 74, I found myself at the front door of a cozy, recreational resort accommodating 450.

I was about to embark upon a ski week at Biff and Tom Wheeler's Gray Rocks Inn located in the St. Jovite

area, under the watchful eye of Real Charette's Snow Eagle Ski School.

The Snow Eagles have 40 fulltime instructors, all certified by the Canadian Ski Instructors Alliance. With this number on the payroll, the classes usually range from eight to 12 students per instructor.

The ski week begins with a Sunday evening movie and introduction period, and then it's quickly into hour one Monday morning.

First there was getting use to standing on skis and learning how and how not to fall.

Next came the grading of skiers (and I use that word loosely at the this stage) into classes of ability. I was right at rock bottom, class 36 I believe.

Everyone is assigned to a class and can progress or be set back accordingly.

The Snow Eagles use the short ski progression method of teaching during sessions from 10 a.m. to noon and from 2-4 p.m.

My opening conquest was a slope of not more than two- or three- feet. Then came the magic of the snow-plow.

Day one ended with a great sense of accomplishment — I had not fallen and had mastered the art of snow-plowing.

Day two, Tuesday, opened with me progressing up a class, under the eyes of Chris Lloyd. It was right into paralleling and then came the infamous T-bar.

My first adventure with the T-bar had me clinging to the pole and monkey hang for dear life. The skis didn't do what I had hoped for them...they crossed, and I and my partner, a young lass from Buffalo, N.Y., went tumbling down the mountain.

Attempt number four mastered the T-bar and parallel turning rounded out the day's chores.

Day three was my final push, and first year instructor Randy Banks from North Carolina got the call, class 31.

I was starting to enjoy skiing and still had not fallen. Just before the lunch break, our class ventured forth to a steeper slope, one I had cast dirty looks at before.

And needless to say, wipe-out number one was performed in graceful style.

A parallel turn that was supposed to be wasn't and over I went... skis in the air down the slope on my back some 500 feet. Arriving to a standing ovation from my class, I noticed that everyone laughs with you, not at you.

Day four and five, Thursday and Friday, it was work on paralleling and parallel turns and onto the chair lift. Saturday morning is race time and the 30 some odd classes are broken down into three divisions.

It was ski around the flag time and a second place in the novice earned a silver pin.

If you are looking for that special teaching method with special effects, Gray Rocks isn't the place. Attitude and friendship is the key and Quebec's first resort had it all to offer.

At Gray Rocks, a various assortment of colorful ski outfits and the latest of all equipment is not expected and not really looked for.

There doesn't seem to be the pretense of trying to impress everyone on the Gray Rocks slopes.

There are no great challenging slopes or heart stopping descents. What there is, is down to earth honest instruction and an intense week of good old fashioned fun.

There are sleigh bell rides and hot wine parties for the classes after ski hours and an all-around general atmosphere that has made the Snow Eagle school and Gray Rocks the "Dean of the Laurentians."

The ski season at Gray Rocks goes from Nov. 20 to the beginning of May. Average snow is 165 inches with base around the 48 inch mark to 12 feet in spots.

There are five novice, six intermediate and seven expert runs with the longest run - one mile.

Gray Rocks has two double chair lifts and two T-bars with uphill capacity at 4,300 per hour. Everything that you would possibly want and need can be rented.

The ski week package, which was created by Real Charette, includes three of the most exquisite meals per day, lift tickets, and 22 hours of lessons along with complete entertainment program (dancing seven nights a week).

The cost per person per week starts at \$151.50.

Gray Rocks - the Dean of the Laurentians, has been tabbed with the "hell-bent-for teaching attitude" and can only be surpassed by the atmosphere created by the people there.

Yearning to learn how to ski or to just sharpen up on the style...give Gray Rocks an honest shot. I am going back up, lookout class 29.



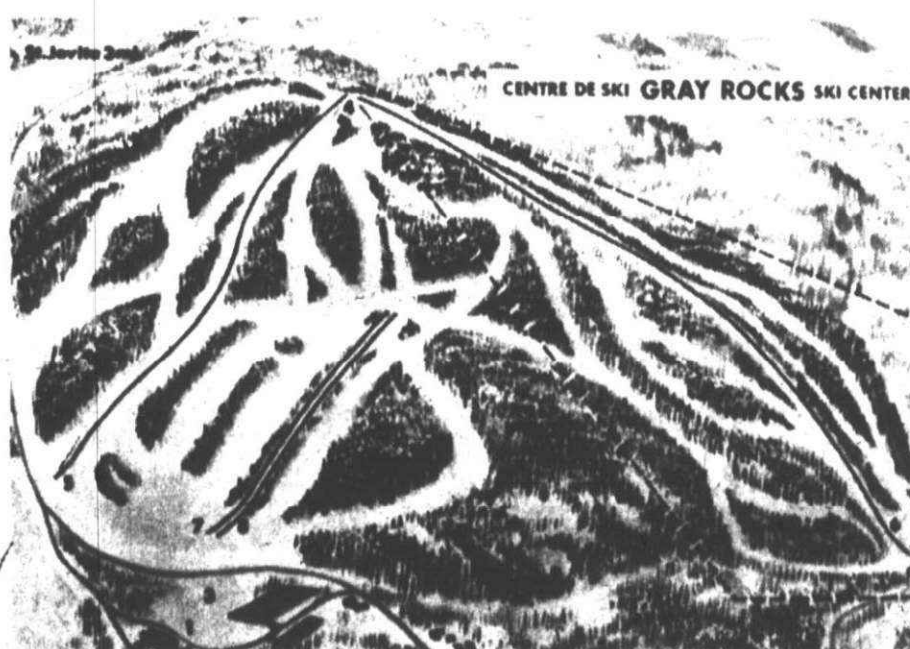
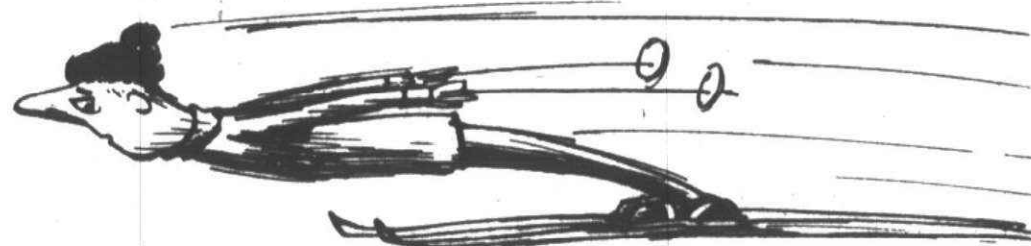

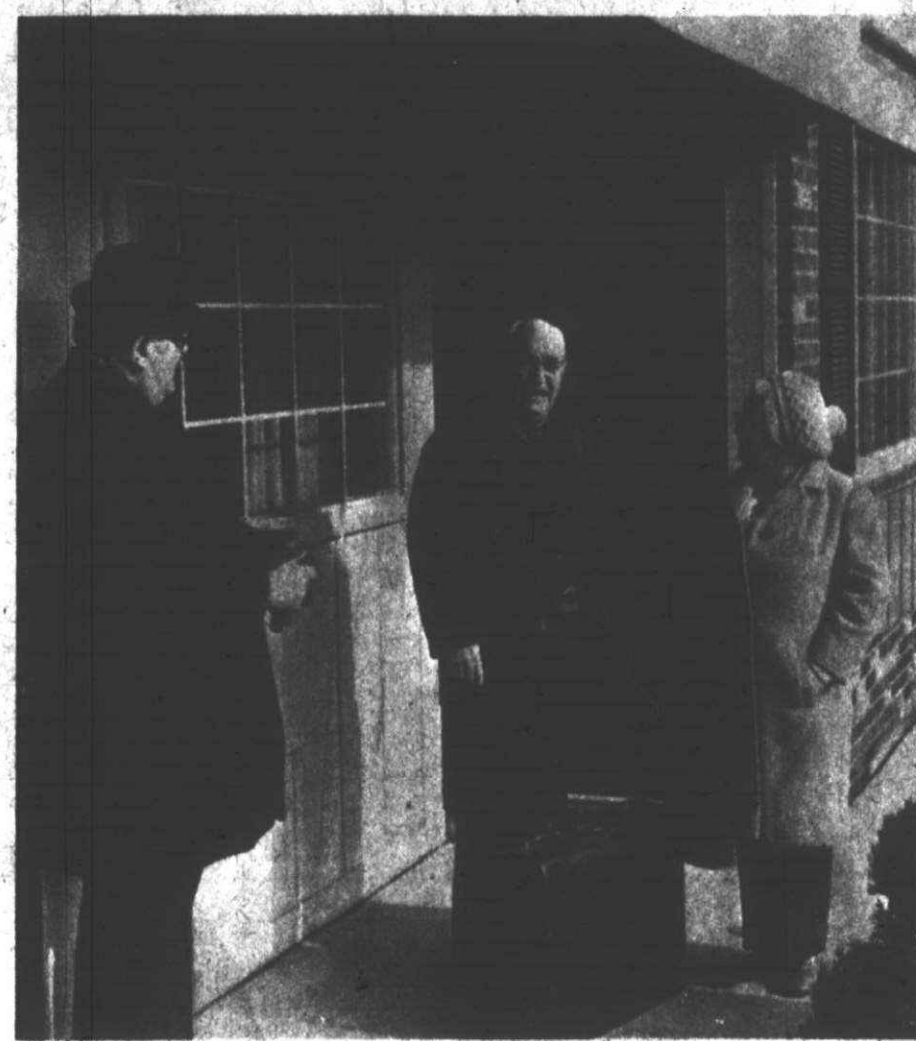

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# Bonstelle production lacks sensitivity

A mental institution is probably the last place you'd look for peace and tranquility. But you probably wouldn't expect the likes of the Bowery Boys to take refuge there, either.

But that seems to be the case in the Bonstelle Theatre production of "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest."

Perhaps it's that Dale Wasserman's adaptation doesn't do justice to the Ken Kesey novel of the same name or that director Robert Hazzard doesn't perceive mental patients drugged into submission as a serious issue. But it was hard to tell if the actors were representing some of the saddest elements of society or instead were at-

tending a casting session for the Three Stooges.

NO DOUBT Kesey intended a good bit of humor as he spun his tale, but instead of seeing a conflict between mental patients and a head nurse who would rather dominate than cure her patients, we have a group of raucous schoolboys trying to intimidate a substitute teacher.

Instead of portraying tragedy with a blend of humor, Hazzard prefers to slapstick silliness which just so happens to be tragic at the end.

Instead of a stern medical staff subduing their patients with tranquilizers, we have a bumbling staff, save the

head nurse, and a group of patients who rally around prisoner feigning mental illness and become a ward of buffoons, not mentally afflicted.

PRIOR TO the arrival of R.P. McMurphy, played by Jim Siatkowski of Farmington Hills, the patients follow a pattern of taking their morning tranquilizers and doing whatever the head nurse tells them, convinced that she is on an errand of mercy and has their welfare foremost in her mind.

McMurphy sees the patients as gutless and sets out to destroy the control of head nurse Miss Ratched, played by Crystal Premo of Livonia. Siatkowski lives up to his role as the wheeler-dealer who cons the

patients out of their money and out of their lethargy. He believes he has them turned against Miss Ratched until she imposes her authority and turns them repeatedly into jelly.

AS NURSE Ratched, Miss Premo isn't quite the domineering force she needs to be, and who can blame her when she is in charge not of the disturbed but of a group of clowns? If she delivers a weak performance, it's because she has no other choice.

The only indication of the tragedy going on in the hospital is in asides delivered by Chief Bromden, played by Garden City's Tom Kjellberg. Although able to hear and speak to his dead father, he is thought to be deaf

and mute by hospital officials. It is through his narrations that we feel the pain the inmates must feel.

Kjellberg convincingly describes the "fog" which descends on the hospital when the staff wishes to torture its inmates with electric shock treatments. He also relays to the audience how he perceives the hospital to slow down and speed up time for the purpose of masking reality from the inmates.

DESPITE ALL of McMurphy's conning, he does have a clear idea of what the hospital stands for. He is the first to discover that the Chief is not deaf and wins him over with his gifts of gum and his ability to stand up to head nurse.

Even though the Bonstelle production would like to have us think of "One Flew" as a comedy, it has to deal with the tragic finale. From a scene of a wild party in which patients mix up drinks in a hot water bag, we are plunged into the close where we view the suicide of a weak patient, a lobotomy performed on McMurphy, his murder performed by the Chief and the Chief's escape.

No doubt there's humor to be found at all levels of life. And no doubt there are mental institution staff members who are inept at their jobs and uncaring for their patients. But it doesn't add up to one big laugh as the Bonstelle production seems to make it.

Leonard Bradley, who plays Charlie, Willy's neighbor and best friend, directed the Guild's "Dark at the Top of the Stairs."

Mary Ann Brownlee Vosgerschian, of Livonia, set designer for "Salesman," directed "The Lion in Winter" and "I Never Sang for my Father," which received the award for best direction in 1973. Ms. Vosgerschian is presently employed by Project CAMEO in the Livonia School District.

Others in the cast are DeNeiges McCann of Livonia, Kevin McGee of Livonia, Susan Taranowsky of Westland and Marion Tournaud of Farmington. Also John Fattel of Farmington Hills, Patrick Kenney of Birmingham, Eva Wojnar of Royal Oak, Dennis Bumpus of Trenton, Charles Elliott of Flat Rock, Val Sisto of Taylor and Max Wolfe of Berkley.

# Hilberry superb in Steinbeck drama

In the wrong hands, John Steinbeck's "Of Mice and Men" could easily sink into melodrama. But Wayne State's Hilberry cast puts just the right touch on the play which deals in large doses of loneliness, emptiness and illusions.

Performed in the same, controlled way as Steinbeck wrote both the novel and play, "Of Mice and Men" tells of deep friendship and gripping lone-

liness; of two rootless men, one strong and the other weak, married to a dream.

The play, set in southern California, is a timeless story of two itinerant farm laborers and their dream of a farm of their own, land they can work and rabbits they can raise.

AL HAMACHER is superb in the demanding role of Lennie, the mentally weak but physically strong one of the pair. His companion, George, is

aptly played by Ralph Pochoda. Both delude themselves with their dream as they settle into another job on another farm, this one differing from others only in its impending tragedy.

One of the most intriguing performances is by James Kisicki as Candy, the aging laborer who has been rendered almost as useless as his toothless, arthritic dog through age and loss of his hand. Candy provides a glimpse of what George, Lennie and the others will be as he fumbles

around, swamping the bunkhouse and grumbling about his life.

But it's Candy's money that inflames the three (George, Lennie and Candy) with the near realization of their dream farm. Ironically, it's Lennie's affection for softness that destroys them all. Seduced by the wife of the boss's son, Lennie panics while stroking her soft hair and breaks her neck while trying to muffle her screams.

Several scenes in the play deserve note, but particularly one where Curley's (the boss's son) wife and Lennie both stare in their own directions and hauntingly tell their own stories. George and Lennie have each other and the dream.

The play, which is suitable for all ages, will be performed again on Friday, Feb. 7, at 8:30 p.m. in the theater, Cass and Hancock.

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# Symphony program combines variety, quality

The Plymouth Symphony Orchestra's family concert recently in Plymouth Salem High School was a 90-minute musical treat, with enough variety to entertain three generations.

The first portion of the program focused on musical trains. The orchestra, under the direction of Wayne Dunlap, played "Pleasure Train Polka" by Johann Strauss, a light, lively piece reminiscent of a chugging trolley. A sharp contrast to this airy polka was "Pacific 231," by Swiss composer Arthur Honneger, who named it after an American railway engine. The orchestra's strong performance gave an audible impression and simulated presence of a powerful, chargin locomotive.

RELYING ON local talent, the second segment of the show featured the East Middle School Chorus and the orchestra performing "Creatures and Colors" by Lee Eitzen.

The work was commissioned by the Plymouth Symphony and first performed in 1963. It is a collection of six children's poems set to Eitzen's music. The international poems capture the flavor of Ireland, Greece, Israel, America, India and Germany.

The chorus, made up of seventh and eighth graders, under the direction of William Grimmer, did a fine job despite the fact the flu-bug had depleted its ranks and consequently some of its volume.

Although the verse was taken from a book of children's poetry, the music's appeal wasn't limited to

youngsters. It was colorful, interesting and imaginative. As Dunlap aptly summarized it: "You don't have to be a child to enjoy a musical poem."

THE SHORTEST but most effective song both vocally and instrumentally was "The Panther," a short, funny, descriptive tale by Ogden Nash.

Eitzen is a former member of the Plymouth Symphony and his wife, Leslie, a former vocalist in the area. The Eitzens are presently on the music faculty of Grand Valley State College, Allendale, where Dunlap is director of fine arts.

Before every number Dunlap explained the musical composition and gave a short explanation of the

story behind the music. This being a family concert, youngsters made up a substantial portion of the audience, and Dunlap's brief introductions helped many to understand the music and add to their enjoyment.

THE OUTSTANDING selection of the program was the orchestra's impressive performance of Mussorgsky's "Pictures at an Exhibition," orchestrated by Maurice Ravel.

Mussorgsky wrote the piece, a series of descriptive piano pieces linked by a magnificent promenade

theme, as a tribute to his artist friend Victor Hartmann.

The symphony's rendition, under Dunlap's leadership, was superb and definitely the crowning portion of the program's story-telling theme.

# Women teachers on move --to the bargaining table

Is women's liberation or the fact that women have traditionally played a dominant role in the classroom the reason that local teacher unions are selecting more women to leadership positions and to bargaining teams? Perhaps both.

Whatever the reason, women are apparently running more and sitting back less. Four local education associations—Livonia, Plymouth, Garden City and South Redford—are headed by women, and there was feminine participation at bargaining tables this year in Westland and Redford Union.

**WOMEN PARTICIPATING** in union activities range from "women libbers" to women who do not associate themselves with the women's movement. But there is a common bond: they all want to stand up and be heard on issues they think important as teachers.

A study in contrasts even exists in the same union as witnessed by Plymouth Education Association (PEA) president Dolly Carter and president-elect Candi Mair.

While Mrs. Carter maintains that her being a woman was of little significance in heading the union, Miss Mair claims there were noticeable differences.

"I'm not a woman chauvinist or a woman's libber," Mrs. Carter says. "I think that people now look at a person and her credibility and vote on that aspect. What it boils down to is the members' confidence in your ability to lead."

She also believes that her sex neither helped nor hindered her as a union head, although she says that, with one exception, being a woman protected her from attacks by the press.

ACCORDING to Mrs. Carter, involvement in the PEA was enough reason to enter union politics. Miss Mair said she headed that way because of new awareness brought on by the women's movement.

"Teaching goes beyond the four walls of a classroom," Mrs. Carter said. "So much goes on from the outside. I felt I had something to say and wanted to be able to say it."

"When you become active in a union, there are obvious advantages; you get to speak to the people directly involved in decision making."

She also believes that it just "human nature" for women to be so active in the PEA.

"The majority of teachers are women," she added. "In the elementary grades probably 90 to 95 per cent of the teachers are women."

"I would encourage anyone, not just women, to become involved in the PEA. So much is always going on. Decisions are made daily that teachers have no say in—such things as items approved at board of education meetings and the way the administration sets curriculum policy."

IF MRS. CARTER notices a difference in union activities as a result of her sex, it's at the bargaining table.

"I think that when there's a woman present at the negotiating table, there's a different mood and a different tone."

"Neither side gets into name-calling or mud-slinging that might go on in the company of all men," she said.

Mrs. Carter's successor, Miss Mair, is more convinced that women's attitudes are changing and that both men and women want "to elect the best person for a job and not just the best man."

"It used to be that women felt they were second-class citizens and understood that a union office was a man's position," she said.

"With the so-called liberation movement, women are freer and more willing to stick their necks out on the line in an election. Before, women simply wouldn't elect another woman."

BARBARA SOWERS, who heads

the Livonia Education Association (LEA), cites four other women LEA presidents and says active women are particular to the teaching profession.

The LEA has always had a lot of women active," Miss Sowers said. "I became active because I felt it was the only way to help an organization."

"I don't think it matters whether a woman is at the head of the union. We're a team and it's a team effort working for the best optimum contract for all teachers."

"We're all educators; I haven't noticed a difference in male and female roles."

"Education is a vocation and the interested look at it as such. Women just haven't had any reason to kick up their heels."

IN SOUTH REDFORD, the union leader is Lynn Golonka, mother of three. Mrs. Golonka is quick to credit her husband for keeping things running on the home front so she can tend to union activities.

"At first I was a housewife and mother," Mrs. Golonka said. "Then I began teaching and then I became active in the union."

"People told me my children were going to be destroyed if I left home but I didn't feel that way."

Mrs. Golonka's own union activism developed because she says she "was

philosophically opposed to the previous leadership."

"And I wanted to increase the strength of teacher awareness and participation."

Since South Redford still does not have a contract, much of her time is being spent these days at the negotiating table. She also plans to run for reelection in February and feels that perhaps because she is a woman she is attracting other women into union politics.

But she is wary of that role.

"I have noticed more involvement by women, and I can speculate that indirectly my being president attracts other women," she says.

"But you know, there are very few role models for us to follow. Even today there is no predominant woman historical figure that snaps into everybody's mind."

"I guess I'm creating new ground and I try to offer all the encouragement for women to become involved as I can."

IN REDFORD UNION, it was a woman who picked up the negotiating slack this fall when state Michigan Education Association negotiators went on strike against their own union.

Cindy Mattingly served for some two months as her union's negotiator. She is now on a sabbatical leave from both her teaching and union activities.

LYNN CARLISLE was the only woman represented on either bargaining team in the Wayne-Westland negotiations. She says she joined the Wayne-Westland Education Association's team so a woman's voice might be heard.

"I think the general level of involvement on the part of union members has increased," Miss Carlisle says. "It's become apparent that if teachers don't stand up for their rights that no one else will."

"I think the women's movement has something to do with women's changing attitude."

"You see a lot of women in teaching now who have families. Before, a woman left teaching for good when she started a family. More women now are looking at teaching as their profession and their life's work."

With four male negotiators on her team, Miss Carlisle said she felt "different" being the only woman at the negotiating tables.

"A lot of the times it wasn't the issues on which we disagreed but the attitudes," she says. "For instance,

they'd think in terms of chairman, while I would think of it as chairperson."

"It wasn't until I opened my mouth and gave my viewpoint on issues that they realized I had a brain."

In addition to the issues concerning elementary education teachers, Miss Carlisle espoused maternity and paternity issues.

The WWEA fought for and received a one-year paternity leave for new fathers. Expectant mothers in the district no longer have to take a long term maternity leave; they may use sick days to have the child and may return to work just after the birth.

PERHAPS THE HOTTEST seat in the area belongs to Ann Riley who took over the presidency of the Garden City Education Association (GCEA) after the union removed Paul Chamberlain from office during the long teacher strike there. But whatever pressures she might be feeling, she's adamant that they aren't because of her sex.

"I have felt no prejudices whatever," Ms. Riley said. "I think people see me as a person and not as a male or a female. At least I hope so."

"I regard myself as being very liberated. I'm a feminist and I've felt that way a long time. The stereotypes are changing and I'll be trying to make things better for teachers, not just women, although women will be involved."

One issue she will have to tackle is the fight for equal pay for female coaches.

"That's an issue not just women are interested in," she insisted. "The male coaches think the women are getting a raw deal too. We'll be fighting for that for a long time."

ALTHOUGH SHE has been active in the GCEA for six years, she believes it was this year that most teachers became aware of the struggles still facing them.

"The teachers' eyes have been opened; they realize they need each other and they will have to fight for their rights and fight to get rid of the board's paternalistic attitude," she declared.

Ms. Riley said she will seek reelection in May because there is still much to be done.

"Basically I want to get people involved in working on committees, she added. "Teachers have to become more aware of the problems and the

inconsistencies which are in the district.

"We have a lot of talent but we have to make better use of that talent. We need to get people working on public relations and working to promote better legislation."

TWO WOMEN, Zita Shipman and Roni Parrington, sat at the GCEA negotiating table. While the two noticed differences because of their presence at negotiating sessions, neither felt there was blatant discrimination.

Mrs. Shipman believes that as long as women have a vote in union affairs, they will always be interested. She also notes that in the lower grades women take up leadership positions because of the absence of male teachers.

"I think our members feel that women can do as good a job as a man, if not better," she said.

"I don't think women's participation is a women's lib kind of thing; it's more an emergence of people digging in and becoming involved with grievance issues and the union on the whole." Mrs. Parrington contended teaching issues are at the base of union activism.

"People are realizing now that teaching is more than just classroom activities," Mrs. Parrington says. "Problems have existed that never came to the floor of union meetings. People are beginning to say, 'Hey, that's affecting me too.'"

"For instance, I've been teaching fourth grade for seven years. Since then the district's enrollments have been falling but my classes keep getting bigger."

SHE BELIEVES there was a definite change at the bargaining tables because of the presence of herself and Mrs. Shipman.

"At first the atmosphere at the negotiating sessions was very mannerly. But at the end, it didn't matter because things were so tense. But I would say the men tried to keep the swearing down to a minimum. Not that swearing burns our ears."

"At our own meetings, before the actual sessions, everyone was to have study areas drawn up. When it came for discussion John Melchor (chief negotiator) asked which of us women was going to be the secretary."

"We insisted that we all take turns with the note-taking, and after they realized we weren't going to fall into the typical women's role, we got along very well. The men took notes and even typed them up for the next meetings."

"The guys were not terribly chauvinistic about anything. We kid a lot about it but when it came to us presenting our issues, the men took our words as elementary teachers and not as women."

While the Leonard Woodcocks and George Meanys will no doubt be around for quite some time, there is probably still more to be heard from the Myra Wolfgangs, Dolly Carters and Ann Rileys.
