### Tempers flare over citizen council

CANTON—A committee of board representatives and citizens was established Tuesday night to discuss proposals for a new citizens advisory council—but not before tempers flared again between Supervisor Robert Greenstein and Trustee Brian Schwall.

The source of conflict revolved around the composition of the committee to discuss the council, as Schwall charged that the board was being "exclusionary."

Between 15 and 20 township residents had been meeting with township planner Mike Manore in an effort to establish guidelines for the composition, goals, purpose and responsibilities of a new citizens council.

Last month they reached a consensus agreement and submitted a proposal to the board. Manore, with the support of Greenstein had written a counter proposal.

The committee established by the

board Tuesday night was to discuss the two proposals.

Trustee Gerald Cheske made the motion to establish the committee, stating, "I just want to see this thing get off the ground." His motion asked that the three board officers, Greenstein, Treasurer Carl Parsell and Clerk John Flodin, meet with six representatives from the citizens group to iron out differences in the plan and get the council under way.

Schwall responded that the motion was "absolutely exclusionary and an attempt to abort what the citizens committee has done."

Cheske replied, "This is not a politically motivated motion, I just want to see the thing get going. I don't care who trusts whom or what—I made the motion in good faith."

Greenstein added that he was "tired of this pettiness."

In an effort to compromise, Parsell moved that Schwall be allowed to participate in the committee's actions if

Mrs. Carol Schwall (part of the citizens group) was not also on the committee.

Schwall replied that Parsell's suggestion was "assinine."

Greenstein then entered the fray and commented, "How many members of the Schwall family do we need on this committee?" He added, "Let's stop this and get on with a vote."

Trustee Jim Poole said, "Something is going on here and I don't know what it's all about."

A compromise solution was achieved when the board voted to have a small committee (of the three board officers and six representatives from the citizens group) meet first. They will take no decisive action but refer their suggestions to a meeting of all the members of the citizens group and all the members of the board.

That meeting will take place at the first planning commission study session in April.

### Township board OKs interim zoning rules

CANTON—Following more than two months of work, the township board unanimously approved the controversial interim zoning ordinance Tuesday night.

The ordinance is termed interim because it is intended to be a temporary measure until the new master land use plan is and accompanying comprehensive zoning ordinance are completed.

Explained Supervisor Robert Greenstein, "We don't want to give up the ship until it is built. This way we can prevent any poor land use that might be contrary to the final draft of the new land use plan."

Several sections of the interim measure drew heavy criticism from builders operating in the township at a public hearing held Jan. 21. Following that hearing, the board and planning commission met jointly to draft the final copy of the ordinance.

The largest part of the ordinance, and one considered "extremely important" by township officials, was the sign section of the document. It prohibits many signs from being erected in the township and regulates the size, and location of those permitted.

The most significant change in the sign text that occurred Tuesday night was the limiting of each subdivision to two directional signs. Previously the ordinance had said that each builder operating in the township could be allowed two directional signs.

Trustees Brian Schwall and Gerald Cheske attempted to prohibit all political signs in the interim ordinance, but were voted down by the rest of the board.

Political signs are limited to five square feet and can only be erected 30

days before an election. They must be removed the day after an election, according to the interim text.

The sign section of the ordinance also specifies that no new billboards can be erected in the township.

Those wishing to erect signs must file for a permit and place a deposit sufficient "to cover the cost of removing or maintaining the sign."

The ordinance also specified that illuminated signs must be turned off when a business is closed. Commented township planning consultant Mike Manore, "We are trying to keep Ford Road and the rest of the township from becoming a neon sign jungle."

The planned unit development (PUD) concept was dealt a severe blow by the interim ordinance. The temporary measure makes no provisions for the construction or approval of new PUDs in the township, pending the completion of the master land use plan. Critics of the interim measure feared that the prohibition of PUDs would become a permanent feature in the comprehensive zoning text that will accompany the new land use plan.

Board sentiment over the lack of control of PUDs once they are approved seemed to be the main factor behind the vote against their continued existence.

Other significant changes made by the interim zoning ordinance affect the site plan approval and the schedule of regulations.

Under the site plan review section, the temporary ordinance stipulates that builders must begin construction on projects within a year of being issued a building permit, or face site plan review again and possible changes or rejection of their previously approved plan.

The builders who spoke out against the interim measure had their biggest effect in side lot regulations.

Originally, the interim ordinance had stated that builders must allow for a minimum total of 15 feet of side yard space on an R1-C (60 foot) lot. Builders claimed that this change would put many of them out of business because they were capable of building only one kind of house on a 60 foot lot.

They claimed houses offered would be smaller and "lower quality."

The ordinance was amended to read that on a 60 foot lot, side yard space must be at least five feet on each side of the house.

## Traffic snarled by new water main

CANTON—What do water pressure and traffic snarls have in common? Not much, unless you're driving down Canton Center Road these days. The township is putting in a new water main from Ford to Palmer roads, and it has resulted in severe lengthy traffic backups the past few days.

According to township engineer Glenn Roberts of Wade and Trim Associates, the main will provide for more reliable service and more equal water pressure throughout the township.

Says Roberts, "It's a transmission main that joins the southern and northern portions of the township. It provides for better distribution of water throughout the township."

According to the engineer, the township receives its water at two locations, Michigan and Hannan roads and Joy and Sheldon. Currently those two systems are linked together by only one main that runs parallel to Haggerty Road.

The new link-up between the two systems will provide insurance for township residents in the event that

one of the systems ruptures at some point. The link-up will bypass the broken main and continue water service for those residents that might be affected by such a rupture.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein, who was informed of the project last

week, commented, "I read this contract that said we didn't have easements along Canton Center at two points. That was costing us an additional \$22,000. We couldn't get an easement at the property between the recreation site and the township fire hall

and at the Ira Wilson estate between Cherry Hill and Palmer.

"I had a lengthy discussion with Mr. Wilson and he granted us the right of way. That saved more than \$15,000."

The supervisor added, however, "I couldn't get a right of way at the other point and our using the county right of way is costing us an extra \$7,000."

Total cost of the project is \$332,000.

### Access to school site reviewed

PLYMOUTH—Another round of resident opposition has prompted the Plymouth School district to take one more look at the possibility of building a construction access road to a new school site in the Windsor Park Subdivision.

Joined by Canton Township Supervisor Robert Greenstein, several residents again voiced opposition to moving construction traffic through the subdivision during the next 18 months when the school is being built.

The board voted to reject the access road last month when cost estimates for the road and a bridge over the Tonquish Creek were set at about \$100,000.

Residents, however, with the aid of Greenstein, did some checking on their own and feel the cost of access road will be closer to \$25,000 figure.

County Commissioner Royce Smith met with Windsor Park Civic Association members Sunday and said he

## 'Volunteer' is byword

"Voluntary" will continue to be the byword of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) despite growing discussion that the six-county agency should have statutory authority.

Dr. Conrad Mallett, newly-elected SEMCOG chairman, replied in an "unequivocal affirmative" when asked if the body could go to the year 2010 using the voluntary approach.

SEMCOG's membership includes about 100 of the region's 400 counties, cities, villages, townships, school districts and community college districts.

House Speaker Bobby D. Crim (D-Davison), guest speaker at the SEMCOG general assembly's annual meeting on the Mercy College campus last week, said no one has introduced a legislative bill to make membership mandatory in a council of govern-

ments. But if there were such a bill, it would be a "red flag" to the bulls of local government, he said.

MALLETT'S approach is no change, therefore, from the beliefs of previous chairmen of the six-year-old agency. All previous chairmen have gone on record opposing a suggestion from Metropolitan Fund leaders that membership be required; that SEMCOG write a charter; and that half the general assembly delegates be elected by the voters.

"I don't think we'll ever be warmly accepted by the public," said Mallett, aware of SEMCOG's lack of public image and the opposition to it from many suburbanites, as well as Detroit residents, who fear it as a threat to local power.

Mallett saw no particular legislative needs in the forthcoming two years.

Crim saw no legislation pending that affected regionalism, but he did

point to the plans for a new state transportation bond issue that would, in large part, be administered by SEMCOG's junior sister, the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

HOUSING, GENERAL planning, criminal justice programs, land use and sewer plans were listed by Mallett as the top agenda items for SEMCOG in the immediate future.

SEMCOG came into existence as the result of federal and state policies requiring regional planning for the receipt of certain kinds of federal aid, beginning with highway aid in 1964.

In his bailiwick of Flint, Genesee County and Shiawassee County, Crim saw strong objections to the regional council there. Flint, with half the population, gets only one-third of the council's delegate votes, he said, and rural Shiawassee County feels no kinship with the more urban Genesee.

Metropolitan Fund is a research and educational foundation that spawned not only SEMCOG but SEMTA. New Detroit and the TALUS (Transportation and Land Use Plan) project. Metro Fund leaders suggested last year that the voluntary nature of the regional system be abandoned in favor of direct public participation. Not only did the suggestion bring anguished dissent from SEMCOG leaders at the time, but Crim last week said not one of the 144 members of the Legislature has produced a bill to implement the idea.

MALLETT succeeds Homer Case, Bloomfield Township supervisor, as SEMCOG chairman. Mallett, the organization's first black chairman, is a Wayne County commissioner and vice-president for academic affairs of Wayne County Community College. Mallett was previously first vice chairman of SEMCOG. Proposed by the nominating committee for the chairmanship this year, he was elected without dissent.

Now 47, Mallett was raised in Detroit and earned two degrees (including a doctorate in educational adminis-

tration) from Wayne State University and another degree from the University of Michigan.

In a varied career, he has been di-

rector-secretary of the Detroit Housing Commission and executive secretary to then-Mayor Jerome P. Cavanagh of Detroit.

## Schools support CETA continuation

Superintendents from Livonia and Wayne-Westland school districts were among other educators testifying Monday at a congressional hearing to support continuation of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) of 1973.

Superintendents George Garver of Livonia, Timothy Dyer of Wayne-Westland, Byron K. Antcliff of Huron, and William C. Simmons, superintendent of the Wayne County Intermediate School District, appeared March 10 before the House Subcommittee on Manpower, Compensation and Health and Safety on HB 2584 in Washington, DC.

THE LOCAL administrators appeared to support the extension and funding of the emergency jobs program, Title VI of CETA.

They strongly urge continuance of the emergency jobs program provision of the act and strongly endorse HB 2584 which authorizes appropriations for fiscal 1976.

"The problems of unemployment in Michigan have reached crisis proportions," testified Simmons. "While the nation's unemployment rate is eight per cent, Michigan's is approaching 15 per cent. Detroit, the rate is 23 per cent and is up to 50 per cent in particularly depressed areas of the city."

IN LIGHT of the critical state of unemployment in Wayne County, the emergency jobs provision proves the necessity for continuation of the CETA program, Simmons added.

The Wayne County Intermediate School District is the largest of 58 intermediate districts in Michigan. It consists of 36 constituent local school districts, 21 of which rank among the 100 largest in the state, and includes the Detroit School District which is sixth in size in the nation.

There are about 41,670 persons employed in public school service in Wayne County.

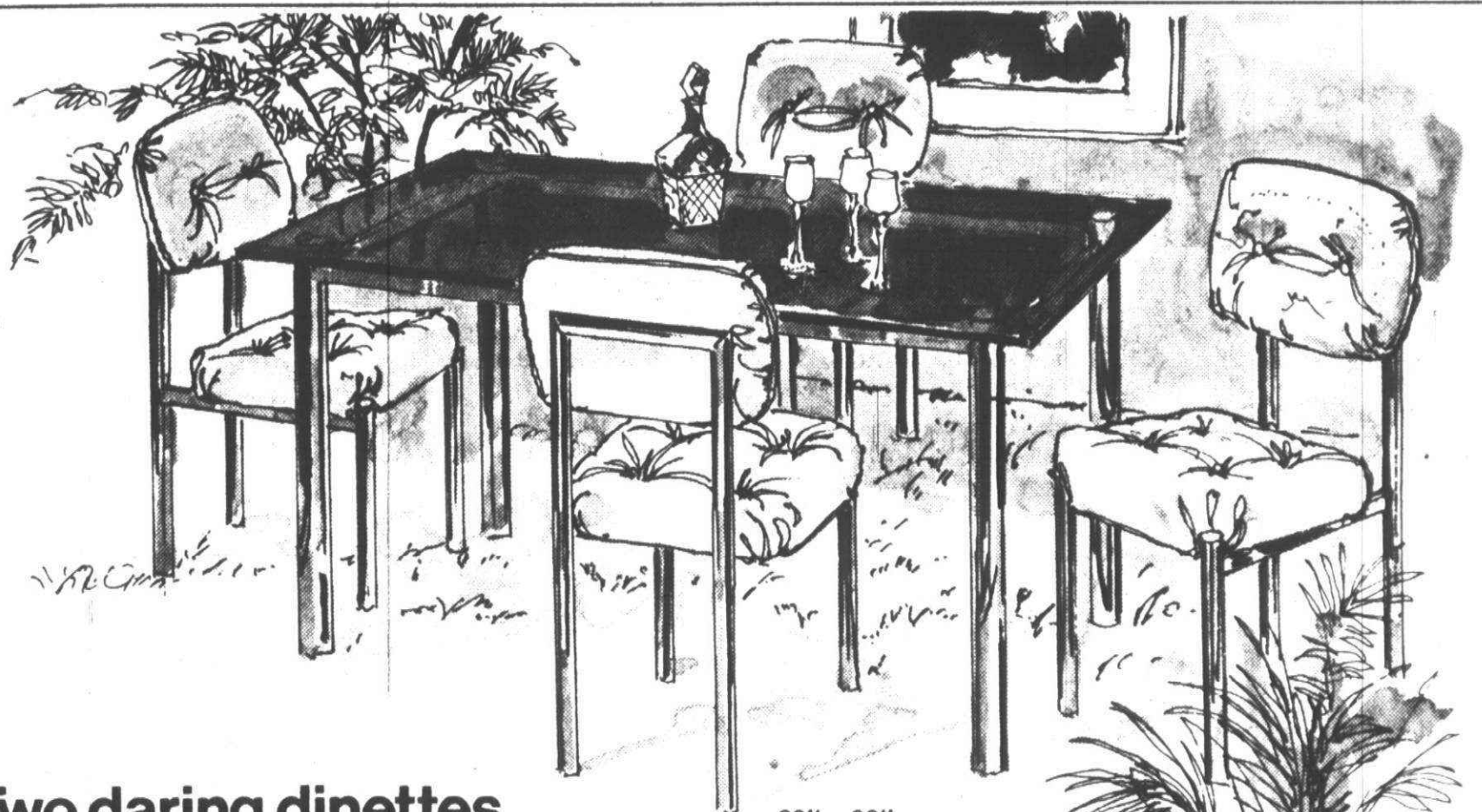
"I urge that the committee continue all of the present CETA programs," said Simmons. "Each serves a vital need. Title VI has an urgency because its statutory authority expires June 30, 1975."

"The educational agencies of Michigan urge increased funding for the present program and the addition of a summer youth jobs program."

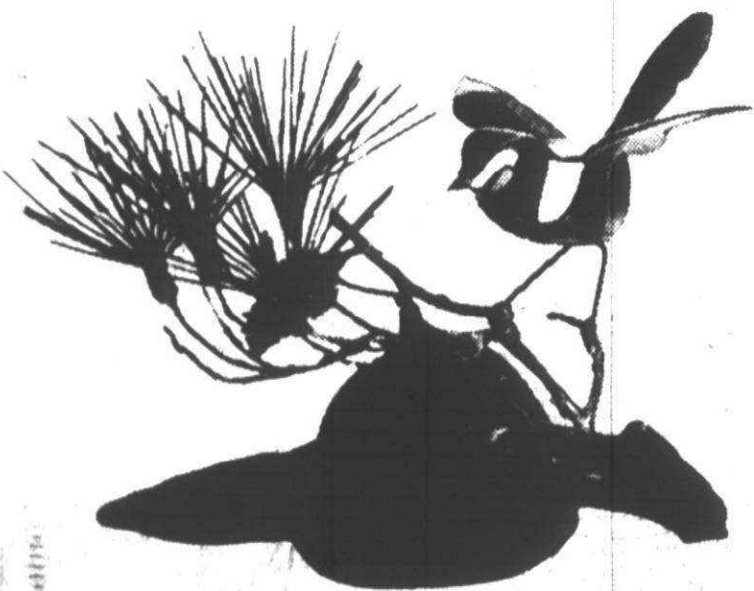

THE CLOSED SIGN is a permanent fixture in Robert Carpenter's grocery shop these days. After more than a decade of business, at 40455 Michigan Avenue he closed his doors for the last time following an armed robbery and burglary late last month. Spokesman for the Wayne County Sheriff's Road Patrol said that Carpenter exchanged gunshots with a

thief in late February and that on the last day of the month he was burglarized. More than 20 cases of beer were stolen, along with ice cream, pickles, sauerkraut and dog food. The back to back thefts caused Carpenter to shut down. Said a sheriff's detective, "Those gunshots really shook him."

## Battle shaping up on overpass lighting

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP— The "battle of the overpass" may soon begin between Canton and Plymouth township officials over lighting costs for the Joy Road bridge spanning I-275.

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees Tuesday unanimously agreed to meet with Canton Township officials at the request of Canton Township Clerk John Flodin to discuss the lighting issue.

Plymouth Township officials tentatively set the date for Tuesday, March 18.

The meeting will mark another chapter in the long controversy over street lighting on the bridge, first started by residents of Canton's Holiday Park subdivision who filed suit against the State Department of Highways and the Wayne County Road Commission in the fall of 1973. In the suit, filed with Wayne County

Circuit Court Judge John O'Hair, residents requested the erection of street lights on the bridge and a traffic light on the east side of the bridge.

O'Hair ruled in favor of the residents' request and ordered Canton and Plymouth township officials to divide the cost of overhead lights, since Joy divides the two townships.

But, although Plymouth Township officials agreed to discuss the matter, some officials at Tuesday's regular meeting believed Plymouth Township should not cover part of the costs.

"Even if the meeting is held, it doesn't infer that the cost should be borne equally," said trustee Russell Ash. "I feel the costs should be borne by those who benefit. I feel at least 95 per cent of the benefits go to Canton Township. They instituted the action without any consultation from Plymouth Township." Trustee Richard Gornick added, "I

think the ramifications of this are far reaching. We could be in an interesting situation where we'd have to light all our perimeter roads."

Clerk Helen Richardson said, "We were never involved in the court suit, and all of a sudden we're in a lawsuit. That's ridiculous. Only two months ago, Detroit Edison would have paid for it."

Detroit Edison informed Canton officials in January it would not foot the \$14,000 bill for construction of the seven street lights.

Canton Township Attorney William Sempliner believes his township can take Plymouth Township to court, if it does not pay for a portion of the lighting costs.

Mrs. Richardson said, "I don't object meeting with Canton officials, but I don't see how we're obligated. We were not involved in the proceedings."

## Teacher dislikes candy sales, milk

WESTLAND—Lynn Ehrle, 42, has the reputation of being a rebel teacher in the Wayne-Westland schools.

He has appeared before the school board on separate occasions to attack two solid American institutions—a glass of frothy white milk and candy fund raising sales.

Concerned about the amount of cholesterol in a glass of "wholesome" white milk, Ehrle, of 32517 Avondale, Westland, was successful in introducing skim milk as an alternative in Wayne-Westland school cafeterias.

"The merchandising of whole milk is a fraud," Ehrle maintains. "I'm not a health nut or a freak, but the harmful effects of calcium and cholesterol have been proven."

Ehrle's opposition to candy sales is

another example of his position on "consumer responsibility."

"Every time school groups want to raise money they decide to hold a candy sale," said Ehrle. "Or a student in elementary school may be rewarded with a piece of candy. This is debilitating, and it reinforces bad habits."

"Consumer education" is the name of the class Ehrle teaches to eighth and ninth graders at Franklin Junior High School. But consumer education is not something that he forgets about when he leaves the classroom.

A FEW YEARS AGO Ehrle co-edited a book entitled "Consumer Rights: Battle in the Marketplace" which was used as a text in high schools and colleges. He is energy committee chairman of the Consumer Alliance of Michigan.

Right now he is gathering information to take on the utility companies' recent rate hikes in a hearing before the Public Service Commission.

And, Ehrle believes that his consumer education class should be only one of many classes in the school where students learn consumer responsibility.

"There should be a kindergarten through 12th grade program of sound authoritative information on consumer issues," Ehrle said. "A student in math class should be taught concrete skills such as being able to figure out interest rates and being able to determine unit pricing of goods when none is listed."

"In a social studies class the impact could be on poor health because of social conditions," said Ehrle. "For example, in inner cities many people have poor nutrition because the poor pay more for inferior food."

Junior high students are already consumers, according to Ehrle, and are developing consumption habits.

"Teenagers have \$15 million to spend yearly," he said. "Obvious messages are beamed to this age group and even younger children. Just as adults are conditioned to media management through a systematic emotional approach, teenagers are susceptible."

The Franklin Junior High consumer education class does not merely teach students how to budget their allowances but deals with everything from product analysis to human survival.

The product analysis part of the class examines the various additives in food. Food products are investigated to see how much salt and sugar is included in their ingredients.

"We're just trying to impress the

fact that we have to cut down on our intake of sugar and salt," said Ehrle. "The average American eats about 100 pounds of sugar a year. Almost every canned food you buy lately is loaded with a disproportionate amount of salt. It covers up the taste of the other ingredients and is a taste we have been conditioned to enjoy."

"But it is common knowledge that both salt and sugar contribute to heart attacks, obesity and a number of other ailments."

THE NUTRITION UNIT of the class is planning a trip to Detroit's Eastern Market in a co-op buying venture. According to Ehrle this will demonstrate "the advisability of quantity purchases and allow students to purchase fresh, high quality produce."

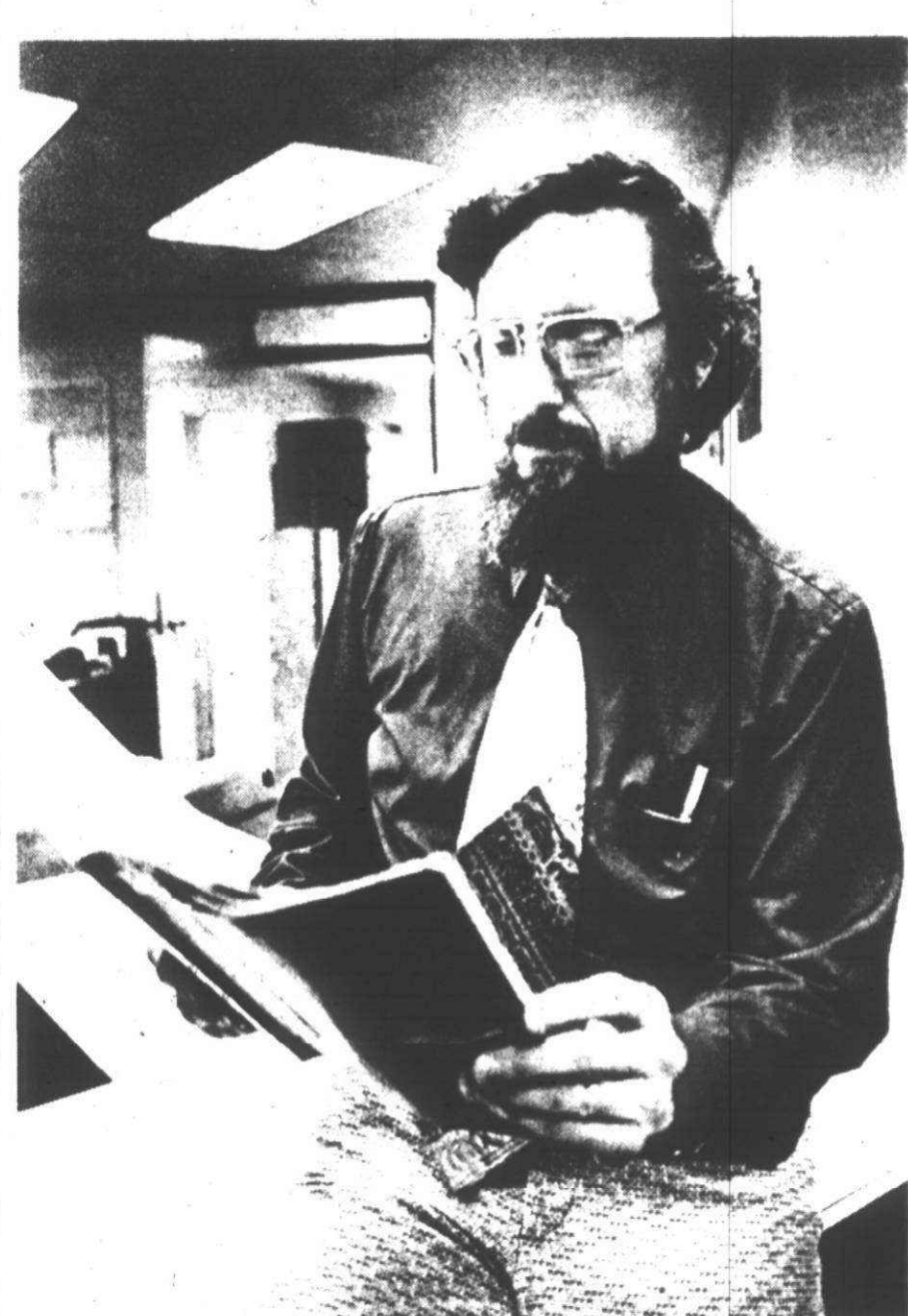
Another project the consumer education students are involved in is trying to eliminate commercials from children's programs. In conjunction with the Action for Children's Television (ACT) organization, the class believes that commercials for sugar-sweetened cereals and GI Joe dolls should not be allowed to interrupt children's TV programs.

Not surprising, one of Ehrle's heroes is consumer advocate Ralph Nader.

"This is an example of a man who selflessly devotes all of his time to consumer education. And we all must educate ourselves. I'm 42 years old. I got into this movement late in life," said Ehrle.

Ehrle made a confession of previous errant ways.

"I used to be a Coca-Cola addict," he said. "I loved the way it tasted. But I was unaware of the problems this kind of steady diet incurs because of the lack of information. And that's what we are trying to do in the class—find out and disseminate information."

## Pursell proposed high school hockey program

PLYMOUTH—The Rocks and the Chiefs may be hitting the ice in November if the Plymouth School Board gives the nod to a high school hockey program.

First attempts at passage of the measure went down to defeat Monday night as the board reached a 3-3 deadlock on the measure, with trustee George Lawton abstaining.

Lawton prefaced his lack of a vote by noting he was in favor of hockey in the high schools, but that he wanted a recommendation from the administration before he voted.

School Supt. John M. Hoben said he favored the hockey program, but stated hockey has not been included in discussions on next year's school district budget.

Hoben added he had favored the hockey program when it was last presented and defeated by the board in 1973.

The request for hockey in both Salem and Canton high schools came to the board from State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) who has recently spearheaded an investigation into kids sports by the state legislature.

Pursell said he favors hockey in high school because the emphasis can be placed on learning skills and "encouraging a philosophy to play a reasonable number of games."

Under Michigan High School Athletic Association rules, schools are limited

to 20 games in the hockey season.

Hoben told the board the school district has negotiated a contract with the city of Plymouth for ice time at the Cultural Center Ice Arena which would give the city 15 per cent of gate receipts.

Estimates by Pursell on the cost of the program at both high schools for from 17 to 22 members on each team were between \$16,000 and \$17,000.

Pursell quickly added that gate receipts could return \$10,000 to the district, producing a net cost of \$6,000 to \$7,000.

When the motion to approve the program was put to the board by trustee Carl Berry, board treasurer Tom Yack asked to amend the program so that it would be funded out of this year's athletic department budget. After discussion, the amendment failed 1-6. Attempts to delay the vote for two weeks were halted when board secretary Marcia Borowski noted "The logic behind each member's voting will not change."

Borowski was joined in opposition by board vice president Marda Benson and Yack, while Berry was supported by board president E.J. McClendon and trustee Gary Mirto. Following the defeat of the motion, Lawton requested board return with a recommendation on the program at the next meeting on March 24.

## 2 appointed by township board

CANTON—The township board filled two vacancies Tuesday night created by the resignation of former planning commission chairman Joseph R. Kinnick last week.

Named to replace Kinnick on the planning commission was Tom Timbario, while Mrs. Joyce Willis was selected to fill his spot on the zoning board of appeals.

Timbario, 28, is an employee at Ford Motor Company and he is currently working on his masters degree in mechanical engineering at Wayne State University. A resident of the Pickwick subdivision, he has resided in the township for two years and is currently a member of the committee to form a new citizens advisory council.

He said, "My personal objective as a homeowner, resident and planning commissioner will be to assure that the township can grow in a controlled

manner with an adequate master plan.

Mrs. Willis, is the office secretary for the Chamber of Commerce and she will serve for one year on the board of appeals. She commented, "I'm delighted and I look forward to serving on the zoning board."

"I think this may be a step by Mr. Greenstein to bring more of a balance to the township. However, I don't intend to be a token woman."

Kinnick resigned last week following the selection of Gus Matzo as chairman of the planning commission in his absence. He cited the new direction of the planning commission and election of the chairman in his absence as his primary reasons for resigning from the planning commission.

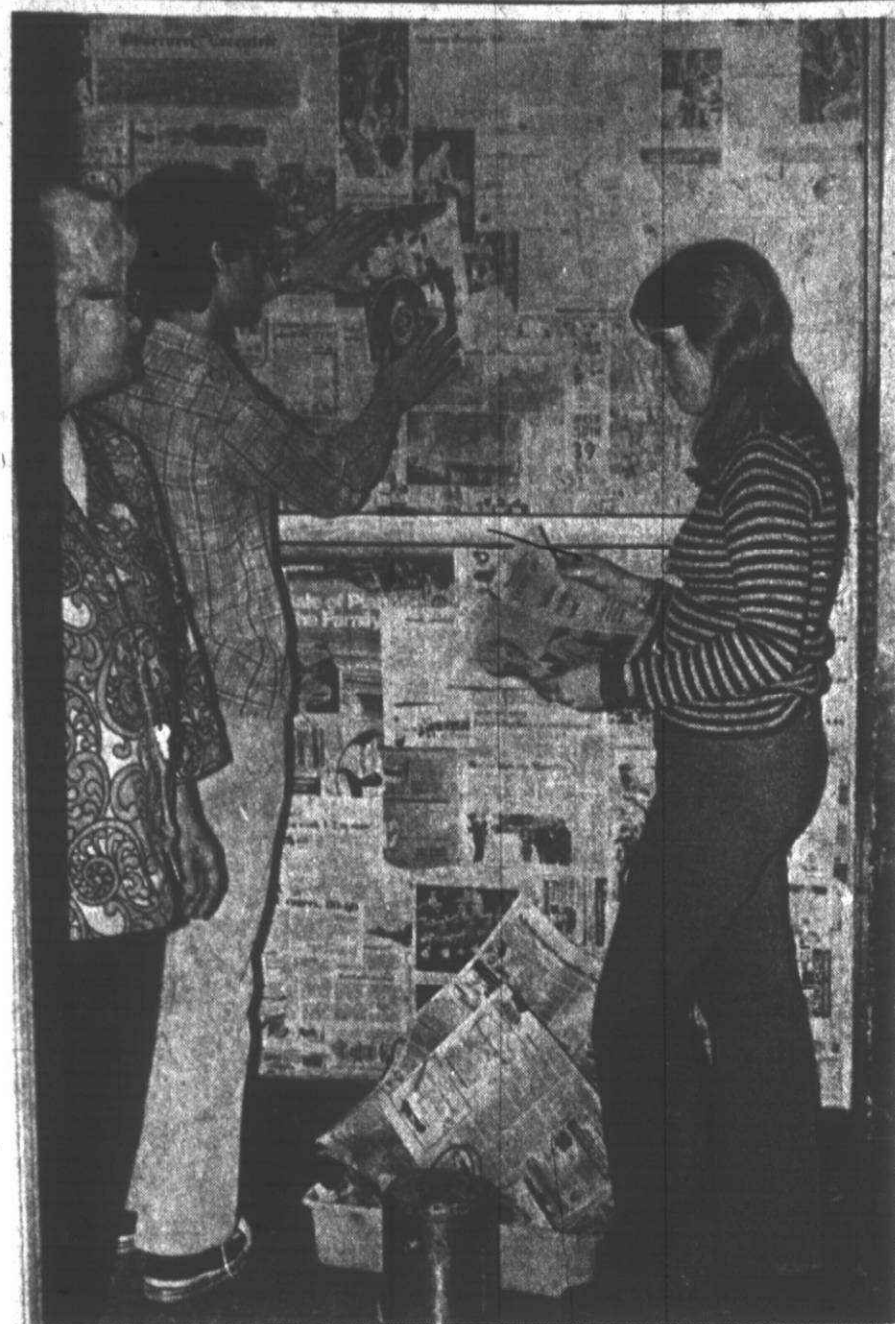

## School access road to be reviewed

felt requirements for a bridge and other costly items for the temporary road might be waived by the county.

More than one and one-half hours of discussion by board members, residents, school district architects and a representative from the Wayne County Road Commission ended with the board's 4-3 vote to reconsider construction of the access road and make its decision by March 24.

Voting in favor of taking another look at cost estimates were board members Marda Benson, Tom Yack, Gary Mirto, and Carl Berry. Noting that "Schools should not be in the business of building roads," board secretary Marcia Borowski voted against the measure and was joined by trustee George Lawton and board president E. J. McClendon.

At the heart of the issue is whether the school district will have to construct a bridge over the Tonquish Creek. Estimates for a bridge which would not restrict the flow of the creek had been set at \$30,000 to \$50,000.

According to WCRQ engineer William Lagosh, construction of the road would cost about \$25 per running foot, or a maximum of \$32,000 for the quarter-mile from Lilley Road to the school site.

## Greater use of existing transit modes stressed

Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) delegates Friday reviewed the agency's Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) which SEMCOG hopes will bridge the

gap between long range planning and development of transportation facilities.

TIP was first prepared in 1973 for the "orderly accomplishment of the highway element of the 1990 regional transportation plan." The second TIP was prepared in 1974 and included both transit and highway projects.

The short range strategy of TIP has been to increase the number of persons using existing transportation.

This includes traffic management techniques, development of bus lanes and car pool lanes on freeways and major arteries and fringe area parking.

Two local requests already are being considered by the Southeast Michigan Transit Authority (SEMTA).

They include a request by Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara for additional transit service along the Schoolcraft Corridor and Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch's request for trans-

it service to western Wayne County, additional bus service and use of the existing Chesapeake and Ohio railroad.

TIP's long range plans are less specific than the annual plans, but must include project description, estimate costs and project priorities.

Some of projects to be included by TIP are:

- Right of way acquisition.
- Highway construction.
- Busway construction.
- Street improvements of a major nature.
- Bicycle and pedestrian facilities.
- Initiation of exclusive or preferential bus-carpool lanes.
- Staggering of work hours.
- Measures to encourage carpooling.
- Regulation of parking supply and cost.
- Programs for transit route revisions.

## Consumer group sues health spa

A class action lawsuit asking \$350,000 in damages has been filed by the Wayne County Consumer Protection Agency against Detroit Health Corporation which is doing business as Silhouette-American Health Spas, National Credit Corporation, and Demand Collection Service.

The latter two firms handle substantial business as a result of transactions from Silhouette and are tied together financially through William F. Hubner of Bloomfield Hills, the agency claims.

Hubner is president of both Detroit Health and National Credit and is also doing business under the assumed name of Demand Collection.

Detroit Health operates a health spa in Livonia on Five Mile east of Middle Belt and has a health spa under construction in Westland.

The consumer agency is a division of the county prosecutor's office.

THE LAWSUIT, filed in Wayne Circuit Court, has been under investigation for several months by the agency which has received some 50 individual complaints from persons who have signed contracts with Silhouette.

Eleven individuals joined the lawsuit with affidavits of their individual complaints against the three businesses.

The lawsuit charges misrepresentations from Silhouette in the form of paid advertisements, brochures and oral persuasions to customers.

The alleged misrepresentations include promises of redistributing weight, relieving sexual impotence due to mental disturbances, and clearing up asthma.

SOME PLAINTIFFS charge breach of contract by Silhouette.

The facilities were not as represented, plaintiffs claim, but were often crowded, equipment broken down and pool over-chlorinated. Not all Silhouette members lost weight or inches after completing recommended exercises.

Silhouette is also charged with unconscionability in methods used to intimidate and pressure customers into signing retail installment contracts.

## The Stroller

# The old time doctor's just a memory

Visiting with Allan Breakie, executive director of the Garden City Osteopathic Hospital, in his office the other afternoon, we got to discussing the great changes that have taken place in the medical profession during the past quarter century, especially the role the doctors play.

The Stroller started it by calling attention to the mushroom growth of medical clinics throughout the area

and noting that their growth followed the construction of such hospitals as the Garden City Osteopathic and St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

Then he asked what had become of the old fashioned doctor who used to make house calls and spent only part of his time in the office that usually was the front room of his home.

The question brought a smile to Breakie's face and he quickly pointed

out that today's doctors, no matter how well intentioned they may be, just can't afford to make house calls—and, more than that, the lighting in the home is not adequate for the doctor to do his best work.

During our conversation it was revealed that the public today is more demanding than it used to be a quarter of a century ago and so many advances have been made that require

special equipment the cost of which is too much of a burden for most doctors to carry themselves.

"That's why you see so many clinics," Breakie said. "The doctors now work as a team. One man no longer can take care of an office and make house calls. So, they form partnerships for the purchase of equipment and then take turns, in many cases, on the various shifts of duty."

THIS IS HOW the clinics came into being. The doctors got together and formed combinations in a manner that would provide the various special services and share in the use of equipment.

For instance, there is one doctor of The Stroller's acquaintance who is in a building with 33 other doctors who rank from the general practitioner to the highest specialist. With a grouping

such as this a patient doesn't have to leave the building. And when the doctor tells a patient "you ought to see a specialist" it no longer requires a trip across town or seeking service at a hospital. The specialist may be right in the building.

The clinic came into being for another reason too. It has become what might be called a "halfway house." With house calls out of the question, and the cost of hospital services so high, the clinic serves those who need help below the hospital level—and at a lower cost.

All these things have come about in the past quarter century and while one can't hold back progress, it is regrettable that the old fashioned doctor who made house calls or sat up most of the night, if necessary, at a patient's bedside is gone from the scene. They contributed a lot of romance to the medical profession.

Much like the mailman who delivered the mail through ice and snow and all kinds of weather, the doctor never allowed the elements to stop him from answering a patient's call—regardless of the hour.

Dr. Loris Hotchkiss, now retired, who was the lone doctor in the Livonia Township area for years, tells how he used to ride horseback in the spring when the old country roads "exploded" and became almost impassable. Even after the major roads were constructed he'd get help from the neighbors to get his machine out on the highway. But he always got there.

It was the same with Dr. Orlyss Brooker, when he located on Plymouth Road, when Livonia had a population of a mere 8,000.

"DOC," AS HE IS BEST KNOWN even today, often tells of the time when he was ailing and would have liked nothing better than a silent telephone when he received a call in the wee hours.

Sick as he was he answered—going out through the night to the patient's home. Arriving there he hastened up the stairs to the bedroom only to collapse right there.

He often laughs now as he recalls that the patient got out of his bed and helped "Doc" into it until he recovered sufficiently to tend to his medical duties.

There is no such romance today. Instead we have clinics where the doctors work in teams for the benefit of mankind.

But we oldtimers sure miss the family doctor who made house calls at all hours of the day or night.

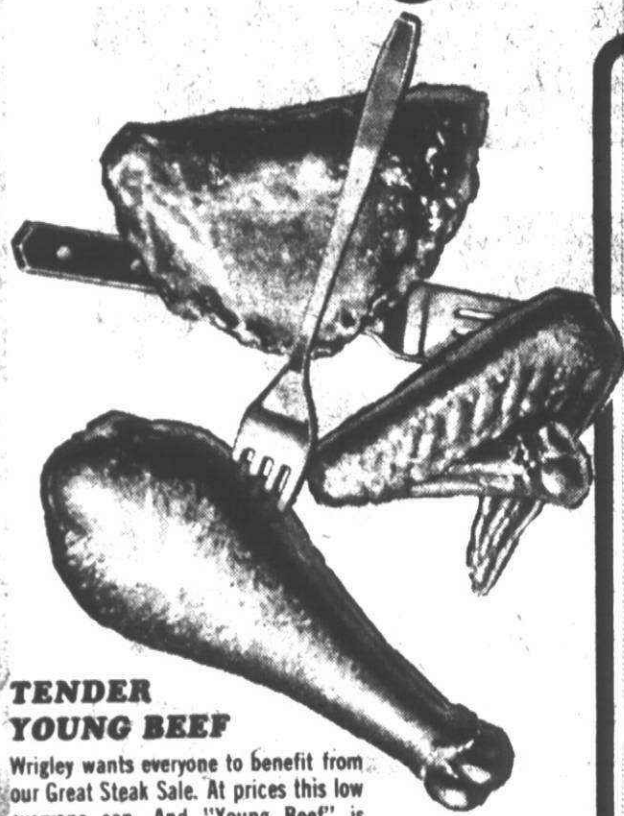

# Ghosts affect earthly bodies

Do you believe in ghosts? Most people do, you know—even those who say they don't.

If you believe in a separable soul, if you believe in any kind of life after death, then you believe in ghosts, for a ghost is nothing more than a disembodied spirit.

Most controversy is really not over whether ghosts exist but over how, if at all, the affect those of us still inhabiting earthly bodies of flesh and blood.

**HARDLY A WEEK** goes by that I don't receive a letter or a call from someone who honestly believes that his or her house is haunted.

Many of these "hauntings" turn out to be nothing more than optical illusions caused by mirrors or weird lighting effects, or noises produced by completely physical means, such as loose boards, tree branches rubbing against the house or mice scampering in the attic.

Still others appear to be poltergeists. The dictionary defines pol-



tergeist as a noisy ghost, but most parapsychologists agree that a poltergeist is not a real ghost at all but a manifestation of energies set off unintentionally by one or more living, breathing human beings.

These energies are blamed for things that go bump in the night, dishes that fall off shelves and lights that turn themselves off and on, or doors that open and close when no one is there.

**BUT SOME PEOPLE** who contact me have had experiences that cannot be dismissed. Some believe that they

have seen and talked to people they know to be dead, such as the widow visited by her dead husband who told her how to locate their long-lost son... or the daughter who was haunted by her father until she kept the promise she had made to him on his deathbed... or the children whose mother returned to point out where she had hidden her will.

Delusions, hallucinations, you say? We can't really dismiss these things that easily. Just because no one else can see or hear them, it doesn't mean they are not very real to those who do.

Ghosts seem to return to or hang around earth-bound people only if they have died under strange or sudden circumstances and aren't aware they are dead, or if they have a particular purpose such as a message to relate to the living.

**EVERYONE** loves a seance, and I have seen some strange things indeed take place during seances. But I refuse to believe that you can success-

fully page a ghost unless that ghost has a reason of its own to communicate with you.

I hope I'm right. I'd certainly hate to think that after I die anyone who wanted to could call me back any Saturday night just to make their party interesting.

My nine-year-old asked me the other day whether I thought our house was haunted. "Why do you ask that?" I responded, thinking that something had happened to make her think our house had a ghost.

"Well," she said, "there are always so many people coming and going around here and so much noise going on that we'd never know if we had one or not, would we?"

"No we'd never know," I answered as a door slammed somewhere in the house.

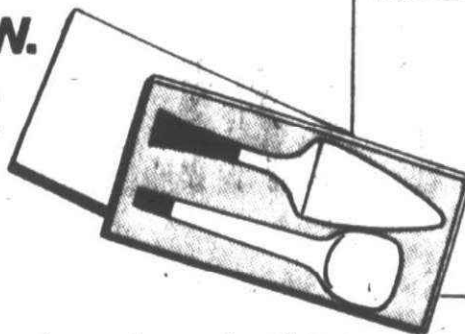

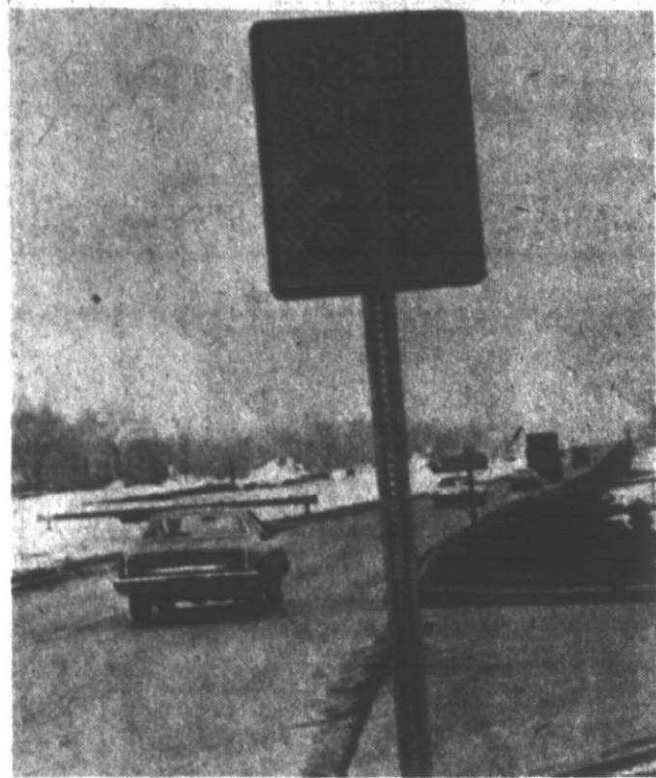

# Highway Dept. signs away its own mistakes



Instead of having safety barriers installed at all dangerous places along the Schoolcraft Highway corridor, the State Highway Department has taken another way of trying to resolve the problem.

Without any advance notice of any kind through the newspapers or other media, the department lowered the speed limit on the eastbound and westbound lanes to 35 miles per hour as a safety measure.

So instead of 45 mph in Livonia from Eckles Road to Middle Belt, drivers suddenly found themselves getting tickets for driving faster than 35 mph.

Then in Redford Township the limit was reduced from 40 to 35 mph from Inkster to Telegraph.

**THIS ALL TOOK** place as late as last Friday by the simple method of changing the signs. We suppose it could be branded as another sneaky way for a state department to try and get off a hook of its own making.

For the past seven months, this editorial writer has been taking the department to task for not forcing contractors to live up to their contracts

and install safety barriers all along the freeway.

The department didn't heed the warning or do anything until a near fatal accident was reported in Livonia when a car skidded off an unguarded turn and rolled over into the embankment some 30 to 40 feet below.

The young man injured in that accident is still taking rehabilitation therapy in the hospital. It will be a long time before he'll be back to normal, if ever.

Then came a series of accidents over the next three or four months when cars skidded, flipped or just rolled over the edge of the road and down into the "big ditch".

Then and only then did the highway department get after the contractors and remind them they were supposed to erect safety barriers along the highway.

At its best it was only a half-hearted effort for there still are a number of places where the edge of the road is less than five feet from the edge of

the embankment. There aren't any barriers along such places and especially in front of Thurston High in Redford Township.

**SO NOW IT IS** the drivers who will be paying the piper, not the errant contractors. There are hundreds of car owners coming from the industrial plants in Livonia and Plymouth who have no idea the speed limit has been lowered.

They are the ones who will be receiving tickets until the word gets around. We appreciate the fact the State Highway Department is slowing down traffic as another means of safety, but we can't appreciate the way it was done.

This is just another case of staid bureaucracy trying to make amends for its own shortcomings. We think it is shameful that drivers bear brunt of a decision over which neither they or the officials of Livonia or Redford Township have any say.

Perhaps letters to State Sen. Carl Pursell and Reps. Robert Geake and John Bennett might have some effect in getting the department to move and move quickly. And we don't mean take it out on the drivers.

## Ask wrong questions, you get wrong answers

I have long held a notion that the reason government often comes up with the wrong answers is that it asks the wrong questions.

They do it consistently in the television industry when a pollster asks folks, "What program are you watching now?" instead of "What program would you like to be watching?" Naturally, you're watching a certain program, but that doesn't mean you think the program is any good. Yet whatever you are watching scores points on the survey. Got the idea?

**A YEAR OR MORE** back, Plymouth Township had a ballot question on whether folks were satisfied with the police service. That fair township has no police force of its own and is patrolled by the Wayne County sheriff's road patrol at county expense.

The sheriff's deputies campaigned hard for a "yes" vote because they would lose work if certain sparsely settled townships decided to establish their own police forces. Besides, the voters in Plymouth Township liked the idea of the county providing their police protection, so they voted "yes."

The question that should have been on the ballot was this: Do you enjoy paying for Plymouth Township's road patrol? And instead of asking it in Plymouth Township, I would have liked to have seen it on the ballot in Livonia, Redford, Garden City and Westland, where the folks have set up their own police departments and aren't dependent on the county. You see, when you ask folks in the outlying townships if they like getting subsidized police, you get one answer; when you ask the folks who are doing the subsidizing, you might get quite another answer.

**THE FARMERS** have a pet taxation plan that has a certain superficial fairness but is actually full of fishhooks, and it goes like this:

Some school districts have high tax bases and some have low tax bases, so let's collect all industrial taxes in one pot, countywide or statewide, and divide the revenue on a per student basis. Sound good? State Rep. Roy Smith (R-Ann Arbor) actually has such a proposal working in the Legislature.

The trick is that only urban industrial property taxes would be shared. But if you consider a farm, you'll recall it has two parts: the house where the family lives and the "plant"—the fields, barn and equipment—which is really industrial-type property.

So instead of asking farmers whether they'd like a share of city industrial property taxes, let's

ask them if they'd like to share their "plant" farm taxes with the city folks. Betcha a nickel they'd back away from Roy Smith's bill in a big hurry.

**THE POSSIBILITIES** are limitless.

In Wayne-Westland School District, voters have consistently rejected salaries for board of education members. So why not have a ballot question that asks: "As long as a school board draws no salary, can he (or she) be free to close his ears to the voters when they hassle him on the phone at night or get nasty with him at board meetings?"

Or we have the friendly (at election time) T. John Lesinski, chief judge of the State Court of Appeals, and his grandiose automobiles for the judges. The use of a car is really a form of compensation to a state official, so let's have Lesinski submit his request to the state officers compensation board.

And when a school board asks voters to increase taxes, wouldn't it be great if, instead of saying "Vote yes for quality education," they said "Vote yes for quality paychecks and fringe benefits?"

That's why I insist that in government the answers you get depend on the way you word the question.

## We can beat economic 'death wish'

Everybody is moaning about the present recession and asking whether it will reach the seriousness of the depression of the early 1930s.

The more people talk about it, the more it becomes a sort of death wish that is bound to happen.

There is more money in people's pockets today than ever before in the history of the country. Inflation has eaten into the buying power of this money, but the money still exists.

A recession is caused when people don't spend their money. If products aren't bought manufacturers lay off employees, employees without jobs have less money and, in a continual circle, the recession gets worse.

**ECONOMIC EXPERTS** tell us that except for unemployment, we have probably bottomed out and the first signs of recovery are appearing on the scene. They expect a major recovery to occur in the third quarter of this year.

There is a difference of opinion among the experts as to how fast the economy will recover, but they all agree that the unemployment rate will not go down very quickly after the recovery, because manufacturers will use up their unused capacities before they hire new people, meaning a lag of possibly six months.

The unemployment figure, which is 8.2 per cent of the nation's labor force, is the flag that the doomsayers use to show how bad off is the country.

**IF THERE IS** not some unemployment in the nation there will be new inflation, because the labor force is in a position to bargain for higher wages, which starts the inflation spiral.

In the 1960s the target for what is acceptable unemployment was 4 per cent. Because of the change in the complexion of the labor force, economists now say full employment is closer to 5 per cent unemployment.

But the present 8.2 per cent unemployment figure is very misleading. The jobless rate for adult men is only 6 per cent, which is well below the

highs of 7 per cent in July of 1958 and 7.9 per cent in October of 1949.

In other words, the unemployment figure was pulled up to 8.2 per cent largely by the joblessness of teenagers and adult women. These two groups make up a relatively larger portion of the labor force than they did 10 or 20 years ago.

While many women and teenagers are the chief family breadwinners, many are not.

**PROTECTION FOR** the unemployed has changed since the early 30s, with unemployment compensation, social security, welfare and other socially oriented programs that have been initiated or expanded over recent years.

The annual rate for these payments, which

are called transfer payments by the government, in January of this year was \$158.8 billion. This compares to a figure of \$28.5 billion in 1960 and \$79 billion in 1970.

The buying power of these transfer payments is equal to all of the retail sales in the nation for about three and one-half months.

Locally, our Michigan recession is caused by people not buying automobiles.

**THE RESISTANCE** to the purchasing of automobiles is claimed to be the increased cost.

It is certainly not due to the lack of money in people's pockets.

As long as people want to believe that we are in a recession, heading for a depression, they keep their money in their pockets and help accelerate it.

The nation as a whole and Michigan in particular must overcome this death wish and get back into the marketplace and buy.

This will generate an early upturn in the economy, will produce jobs and will actually help keep the inflation rate down because all of the government borrowing to fund its welfare programs will in the long run, create more inflation later.

## Hockey winner loses face

What causes sports fans to go berserk once they follow their favorite team out of town?

That's the question bothering top officials of Livonia School District after a sad situation a week ago in Wyandotte when Livonia Churchill ousted Ecorse in a regional hockey tournament game.

The thing that disturbs those who follow sports closely is that there weren't any incidents in the district and regional basketball tournaments at Churchill and Franklin High Schools.

**GENERALLY**, when one learns that teams from Detroit are playing in a tournament, he kind of thinks there'll be trouble either during the game or immediately afterward.

The reason for these thoughts emanates from the fact that most of the Detroit public school games are played in the afternoon before either no audience or a limited crowd.

Why such a rule? There has been so much violence during and after sports events in Detroit that the Board of Education decided on limiting crowds rather than dropping the entire program.

**ALL OF WHICH** leads us to the reason for bringing these things up. There was a very sad situation at the Churchill-Ecorse hockey game. Incidents happened that shouldn't occur at any high school game.

Strangely enough, our reports are that most of the bad language and poor manners came from the Churchill side and that seems a bit strange since Churchill, the Livonia city champion, was out in front all the way and had things pretty much as it pleased.

The language reached the lowest possible level, and some of the actions were bad enough to have fomented a riot. Perhaps that's what the misguided Churchill fans wanted. They were away from home and could act as they pleased.

As it turned out, Churchill won easily and then lost in the championship game two nights later.

The fact remains that a group of Churchill fans were guilty of the worst kind of tactics. Unfortunately no reprimands can be handed out, but the Livonia Board of Education should take a good look at future hockey tournaments and decide whether it's worth all that harassment.

## Rocks meet Pontiac Central tonight

# Thomann prepares Salem for quarterfinal clash

Fred Thomann sat in the kitchen of Plymouth Salem High School cafe-

teria Tuesday picking at a tuna fish salad and sipping a cup of black coffee.

"I've been sleeping really well during the tournament. But I'm a ner-

vous eater. I've gained 10 pounds," he said.

The tournament in question is the 51st annual Michigan High School basketball tournament and Fred is the man who has led Plymouth to the quarterfinal round. That is the farthest a Plymouth team has ever progressed in the tournament and is only three games away from the state championship.

PLYMOUTH'S OPPONENT in the quarterfinal round will be Pontiac Central, a dangerous, quick team which traditionally makes a tournament run. "To beat Pontiac Central we have to do two things," Thomann said. "We have to completely dominate the boards and we have to handle their quickness."

Thomann is a coach who knows what winning is all about. Now in his third year at Salem, he has coached the Rocks to seasons of 15-6 and 21-3 and is currently 21-2 this season.

The team revolves around 6-10 senior center Eric Agardy but according to Thomann, balance is the key word to describe it.

"I tell my players that if they are open they are obligated to shoot - and we have some good shooters on the team. I don't have any doubt in my mind that if we went to Agardy all the time he would average 35 or 40 points a game. But I think that would be a mistake. If you depend on one man and you run into a team that can defend that man, you're in a lot of trouble," he said.

THOMANN CALLS THIS his best team in eight years of coaching at the high school level because it is "a team that has everything."

"This team has a big, strong center, a shooting forward and a quick forward along with a pair of solid guards who can hit from the outside," he said.

Thomann said that he was con-

cerned about a pressing defense of Pontiac Central but thinks he has the man to bring the ball up the court in junior guard Brian Wolcott.

"I think that the only way they can hurt us is by playing aggressively over the entire court. But Wolcott is a fine ballhandler. I don't believe that anyone's taken the ball away from him in a one-on-one situation all year," Thomann said.

The Rocks have played tough defense all season, holding 12 opponents to less than 50 points in 23 games. Thomann said he will likely change defenses often against Central in an effort to keep the Chiefs off balance.

"In all of our defenses, the object is never to give the opponent an uncontested shot from anywhere on the court and we do that quite well. If a

player is guarding an area, it's his responsibility to get a hand in the shooter's face. If he can't do that, he's sitting next to me on the bench," Thomann said.

THE SALEM COACH has tapered practices this week to build up for the game. He expects to arrive with his team 90 minutes before the game to "give all a chance to get the feel of the gym."

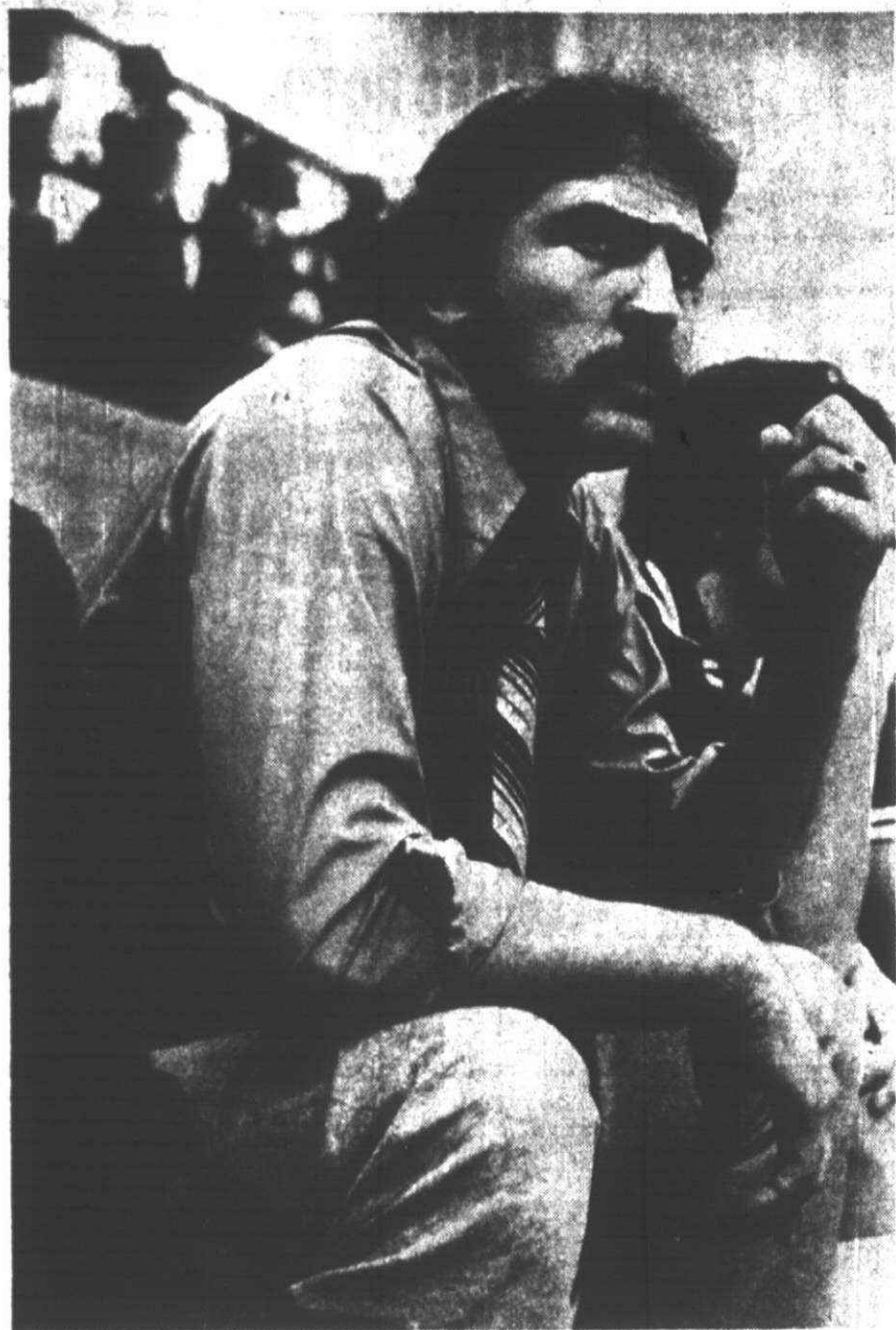
"We've been talking about this tournament for a long time because I knew we had the potential to go a long way. But if we lose, I know it won't be the end of the world," Thomann said.

"All the same," he added, "I hope the newspapers have to come and talk to me on Friday about our semifinal game."

## Area flyweights take Golden Gloves titles

Western Wayne County's 106-pound wonders, Westland's John O'Neill and Livonia's Danny Marderosian, both came through in championship form in last Friday's regional Golden Gloves boxing tournament.

O'Neill, who boxes at the championship "A" level, scored a one-round technical knock out over Highland Park's Angelo Smith and Marderosian, fighting at the "D" level, took a unanimous decision over Clyde Hillman of Leamington, Ontario.

O'NEILL'S victory was especially impressive as it advanced him to the Golden Gloves' tournament of champions to be held in Knoxville, Tenn., beginning March 29.

"I came out and got him against the ropes early and hit him with a flurry of punches. Then I moved him to a neutral corner and hit him with more combinations. After I went to my corner after the first round, my trainer told me that he was knocked out. He didn't want to fight any more," O'Neill said.

O'Neill, who is trained out of Kronk Recreation Center in Detroit by Emmanuel Stuart, was hardly touched by his opponent. He said that it was not

his object to score the TKO.

"We don't look for the knockout, but if it comes, it comes."

Although transportation has not yet been arranged, O'Neill is already in preparation for his trip to Knoxville later this month.

"THAT TRIP MEANS a lot to me. For one thing, it will be the farthest away from home I've ever been," he said.

O'Neill is currently concentrating on his roadwork in preparation for a possible two bouts in one day schedule he may face at the tournament of champions.

After the tournament, O'Neill will likely compete in the Michigan AAU championships in early April. But for the moment, he is satisfied with his current status.

"This is the first time I've been Class A champ. That really means a lot."

Although Marderosian does not qualify for the tournament, his decision was equally impressive.

"I think I confused him a lot because I'm lefthanded and there aren't too many lefties around. Lefthanders usually bother righthanders and he

came up to me after the fight and told me that he had never fought a lefty before."

Marderosian knocked down Hillman once during the fight, flooring the Canadian with a straight left to the head in the second round.

There was no doubt who was in control of the fight all the way.

"I FORCED HIM into the ropes and jabbed him with my right and looked for openings for my left. My left hand is where my power is."

Marderosian was at a six-inch height disadvantage - a factor which bothered him some before the fight.

"I had never fought anyone that tall in my weight class. But I just tried to be aggressive and it wasn't really a problem."

Marderosian must now wait until the AAU championship before competing again.

### Tigers beat someone—the clock!

There is someone the Detroit Tigers had no trouble beating consistently during the 1974 season—the clock.

The Tigers played their nine-inning road games faster than any other team—two hours, 17 minutes.

The Chicago White Sox were almost as efficient, averaging 2:19.

In home games, only the Milwaukee Brewers were faster than the Tigers, the Brewers raced through their outings in 2:19, while the Tigers and Oakland Athletics averaged 2:21 at home.

The Tigers and California Angels apparently couldn't wait to get away from one another; their games averaged 2:01 at Tiger Stadium. Other brief encounters were the Tigers and Brewers at Milwaukee; the Brewers at New York; and the White Sox at Kansas City, each played in 2:02.

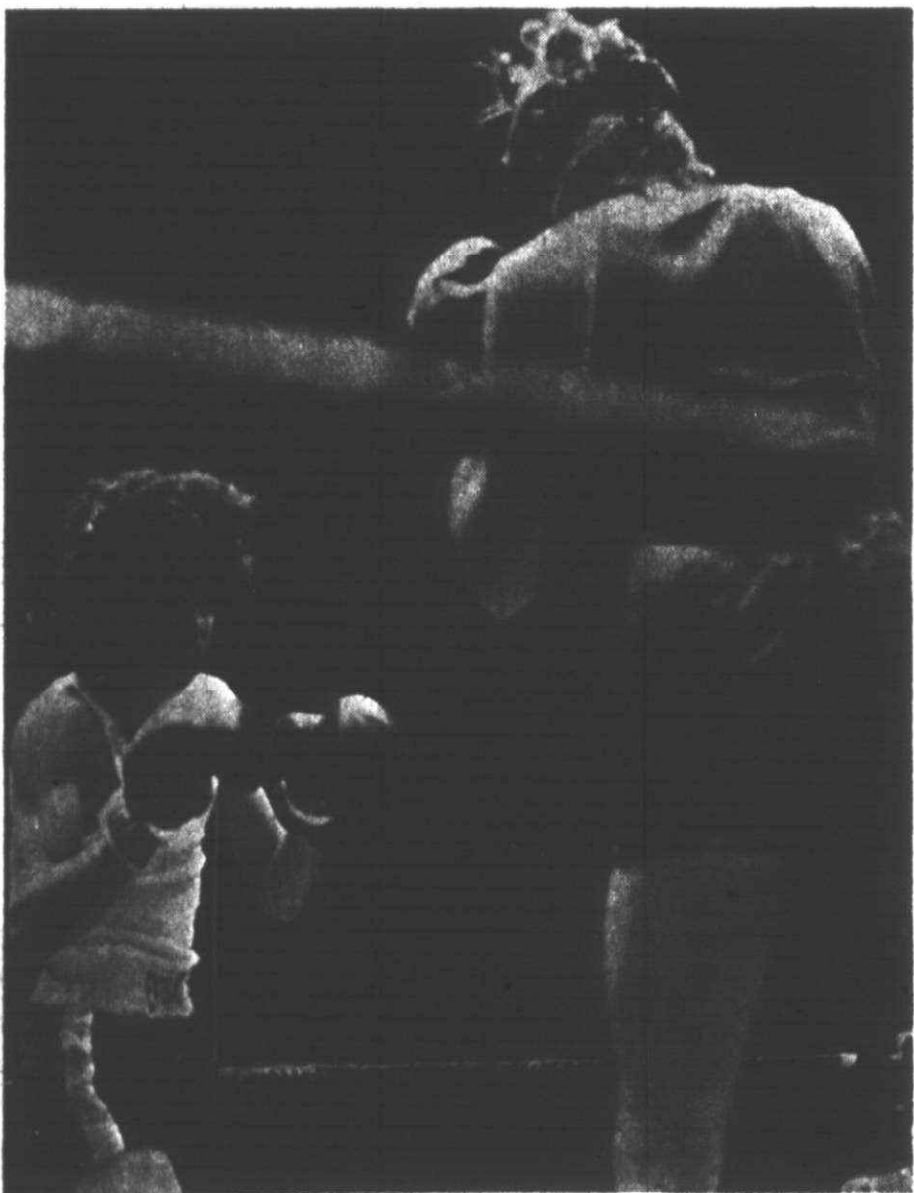
The average time for all American League contests was 2:25, but the Tigers had games of considerably shorter duration.

They finished three road games in 1:45 (Chicago, California, New York); their shortest home game was 1:54 (New York); and they played 14 games in two hours or less.

The Tigers played only two nine-inning games that lasted longer than three hours; 3:01 and 3:03 against the Minnesota Twins.

The slowest teams in the league are the Texas Rangers at home, and the New York Yankees on the road; each averaged 2:35.

No one has to tell Ralph Grubb about the Michigan High School basketball tournament. The veteran Pontiac Central coach has been to the top before and when "March Madness" swings into action again tonight, Plymouth Salem will be facing the state's most experienced Class A tournament coach.

In seven years as the head man at Central, Grubb has brought his Chiefs to the state finals twice, to the semifinals four times and to the quarterfinals five times. Pontiac Central has won 12 consecutive district titles.

Such is the tradition the Rocks will face when the opening tip of the quarterfinal game takes place tonight at Ferndale in an 7:30 p.m. game.

**SALEM IS RATED** a solid six-point favorite primarily because of its overwhelming height advantage and Grubb knows that getting the boards is liable to be a big problem.

"We give up 18 inches on the front

line," said Grubb.

Central's tallest starter will be 6-2 forward Nate Haynes. Teaming with Haynes up front will be 6-1 center Kerry Cato and 6-0 forward Alphonso Bouie.

Those three will face the task of stopping the Rocks' 6-10 Eric Agardy and 6-8 Jim Ellinghausen.

But according to Grubb, there will be little change in the play that brought the Chiefs to the quarterfinals to atone for the lack of height.

"We intend to do the same things we've been doing all year. It's too late to change things around now. It would just confuse what the players have already learned," he said.

**WHAT THE CHIEFS** usually do is play a running game with a man-to-man defense. They press, but only as a token gesture.

"We don't expect to get many turnovers from our press. We usually

press just to stay loose," Grubb said.

While Central almost always goes man-to-man on defense, don't be surprised to see the Chiefs slip into a zone — especially if things are not going well for them. This was a tactic which worked successfully when they eliminated defending Class A champions Brother Rice, who were led by 6-9 center Will Franklin, in regional competition.

"We haven't really made up our minds about defense," Grubb admitted.

Central "suffered" through a 10-10 regular season, definitely substandard for a team which is usually a state power, and was led in scoring by 6-0 guard Jeff Smith who canned 20 points per game.

"Our record wasn't that impressive, but it was pretty good for the talent we have," said Grubb.

The Chiefs have won five straight games in the tournament. Grubb had

Salem scouted once this season, when the Rocks eliminated Detroit Denby to gain the quarterfinals. Grubb's reaction to the Salem team?

"THEY ARE DEFINITELY a good ball club. And they are huge," he said without elaboration.

Grubb has a simplistic attitude towards his team's chances in the tonight's game.

"We will do the best we can do. If that's good enough, we'll win. If it's not, we'll get beat," he said.

Believe that if you like, but veterans of this Michigan High School tournament know the sorcery of Ralph Grubb and likely as not, he'll be pulling everything he has from his bag of tricks against Salem. If the Rocks are not at their best, they could very well learn that when the state tournament rolls around, the Pontiac Central tradition always makes the Chiefs a threat for the Class A title.

## Turf Tips, Quips

The city of Northville is the latest to join the "Get rid of Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley" group.

In a resolution passed a week ago, the Northville City Council asked Gov. Milliken to relieve the commissioner from his duties for "ineptness in administering policies and procedures of the State Racing Commission."

It further asks "immediate action be initiated to establish a three-man board of State Racing Commissioners to reduce the possibility of patronizing and unethical administration of the affairs of the State Racing Commission."

The council charges that Shirley made certain statements to certain City of Northville elected officials concerning summer racing dates at Northville Downs and did "knowingly influence their decisions concerning use of taxpayer monies to effect public improvements and to plan for the future in support of continued summer racing at Northville Downs."

**THE RESOLUTION** has been sent to the Governor's office and the councilmen are expecting some sort of answer quickly.

Meanwhile in Lansing, rumors persist that Shirley will be dropped from the racing post within another week or 14 days.

It has been known for some time that Milliken has been thinking of making a new appointment to the position. However, Shirley was involved in a summer date suit with Northville Downs and nothing could be done until the suit was resolved.

Circuit Court Judge Thomas Foley did hand down the ruling two weeks ago in which he, in effect, said the commissioner did have the right to allot dates as he saw fit.

There hasn't been any indication that Northville Downs plans to appeal the ruling to a higher court. Inasmuch as the suit involved 1975 racing dates, it appears there would be no or little chance of an appeal getting a ruling to change the dates.

**IN LIVONIA**, the Detroit Racing Association finally opened its thoroughbred meeting after a 13-day delay due to negotiations with the mutual clerks union over a 1975 contract and the opener was a tremendous success.

Matter of fact, the crowd of 12,400 caught the DRA by surprise and caused quite a few opening day miscues. Inasmuch as the management had estimated the first day's crowd would be 10,000 or less, it opened only enough mutual windows to take care of that number.

Thus, although pleasantly surprised

by the big turnout, the betting lines weren't able to handle the bettors and hundreds were shut out during the afternoon.

Then there was an increase in the parking fee from 50 cents to \$1 which wasn't announced. There was quite a bit of haggling over that.

But when the day was over wagering had soared to \$953,000 which was the best opening in several years at the Detroit Race Course... for which Vice President and General Manager Dick Wilson was more than happy.

"We knew there were some things we had forgotten," said Wilson. "But it must be remembered the union contract was only accepted by the negotiating committee Tuesday morning and ratified by members Friday. We didn't have much time but did the best we could."

"Now with a two-year contract we can settle down to a daily routine and straighten out all of the problems as they come up. We were real happy with the opening and hope business continues to show that kind of improvement for the remainder of the meeting."

**FOR THOSE** who have been wondering where Jack Richards, the popular owner of harness horses, has been for the past three months, the answer fi-

nally came from Jack himself Tuesday.

Jack suffered a heart attack shortly before Christmas, was hospitalized for the better part of three weeks and has been at his Livonia home taking things easy.

We have long considered Jack as one of our friends in the harness racing business and in daily activities... but we didn't even know he was ailing until he called and told us.

He is at about half-speed again but has just about disposed of all his pacers. Jack has a farm outside of Northville that will be the next to go. He plans to keep up his interest in harness racing but only as a spectator and not an owner and trainer from this time on.

**IN JUST THREE** weeks the DRC will go to Sunday racing. It will be interesting to see what happens. It will be recalled that Hazel Park runners had Sunday programs last year but dropped them when the crowds dropped drastically as cold weather came in.

The DRC will be starting at the tail-end of winter, they hope, and continue through the spring and early summer. It will be a true test of whether Michigan fans want Sabbath races or not.

## Divider adds storage space

## US researcher will address beekeepers

Michigan honey producers will receive honey bee swarm control guidelines during Michigan State University Farmers' Week, March 17 to 21. Beekeepers will meet at Kellogg Center March 18 to 19. The sessions, sponsored by the MSU entomology department, are intended for beginning and professional beekeepers. Speaking during the program will be Dr. Floyd E. Moeller, research leader, North Central States Research Laboratory, University of Wisconsin. "Swarming is the natural reproduction of the honey bee colony. It usually occurs early in the season as the daylight hours lengthen until the third week of June. Thereafter, the days gradually shorten, swarming is less likely to occur," Moeller says.

# The Green Thumb

Now that the seed catalogs are all in, you might want to consider which flowers will tolerate pollution, soot and summer heat. Here are some recommended by the National Landscape Association.

and you might want to consider them for your home: CANNA or Indian Flag has large banana-like leaves and blooms many colors. FOUR O'CLOCK will bloom in the

midst of desperately polluted conditions. CLEOME or Spider Flower are quite resistant to urban pollution. PERIWINKLE (Vinca rosea) has waxy leaves that shrug off dust. IMPATIENS or sultana is an ideal flower for shaded areas and is pollutant proof.

MALTESE CROSS or Lychnis chalcidonica is a perennial that is tough and drought resistant.

KOCHIA or summer cyprus is noted for its feathery foliage, not flowers. It is a good, fast inexpensive hedge.

ANGEL TRUMPET (Datura) has huge fragrant flowers.

SHASTA DAISIES are one of the few "city flowers" that are good for cutting.

COSMOS is another hardy flower with colorful blooms and lacy leaves that stay clean.

MOONFLOWER vine, a relative of the morning glory, has huge smooth leaves that are easy to wash and clean.

Although more gardeners are planning to raise vegetables this year, we all agree that flowers are still important for our souls and peace of mind.

Right now "flying dandruff" insects or white flies are buzzing around your plants, and they'll become more plentiful as the weather gets warmer. Control is not easy, but it's possible. Dish water containing a detergent (any will do) helps. Dip plants in—pot and all. This not only washes dirt and dust off the plant and pot, but washes insects and eggs away.

People who do this do not wash the detergent off afterward. You can spray with a household detergent at the rate of one tablespoon in a gallon of water. Be sure to shake thoroughly, and apply as a soft mist on top and bottom leaves. It's easier to prevent an infestation than to eradicate one.

GREEN THUMB CLINIC: "Could we plant garlic bulbs found in a store?"

Answer: Yes. Separate the sets before planting. A mother bulb is made up of several sections called cloves. A pound of garlic cloves plants a 20-foot row.

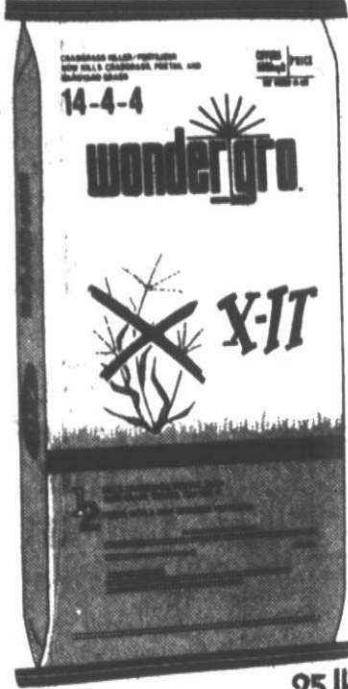

## Plant of the week

Pilea involucrata, a member of the nettle family, is a quick-growing and easy to raise houseplant. It is sometimes called the "artillery plant" because it forcibly discharges pollen somewhat the way weeds do.

Growing about one foot high, P. involucrata is a branchy half-succulent herb. The deeply quilted leaves are opposite but unequal in numbers.

There are more than 200 species of Pilea in the tropics. Most are annual or perennial herbs, sometimes creeping and wide spreading.

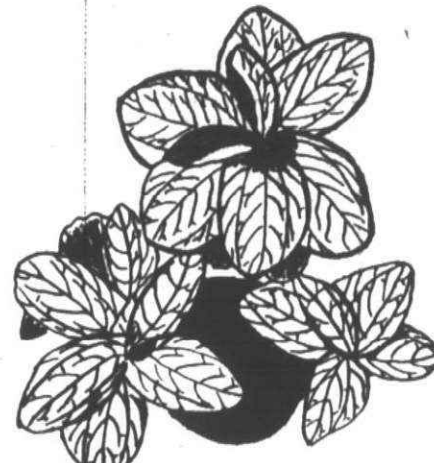
Michigan State University horticulturists recommend the following general environmental conditions for growing Pilea in the home:

SOIL—Use a mixture of equal parts perlite or vermiculite, good garden soil and peat or humus. Purchased potting soil is a mixture similar to this and is usually sterilized.

If mixing your own, bake the moist mixture in a 180 to 250-degree F oven for 45 minutes to one hour to eliminate harmful bacteria.

WATER—Keep the soil evenly moist but not constantly wet.

TEMPERATURES—The plant re-

quires warm temperatures. Daytime temperatures can be as high as 80 to 85 degrees F and night temperatures should be 62 to 65 degrees F.

LIGHT—Diffused light is ideal. A place near an east window in the summer provides the right amount of light. If near a south window, shade the plant from direct sun.

PROPAGATION is by seeds, stem tip cuttings or division.

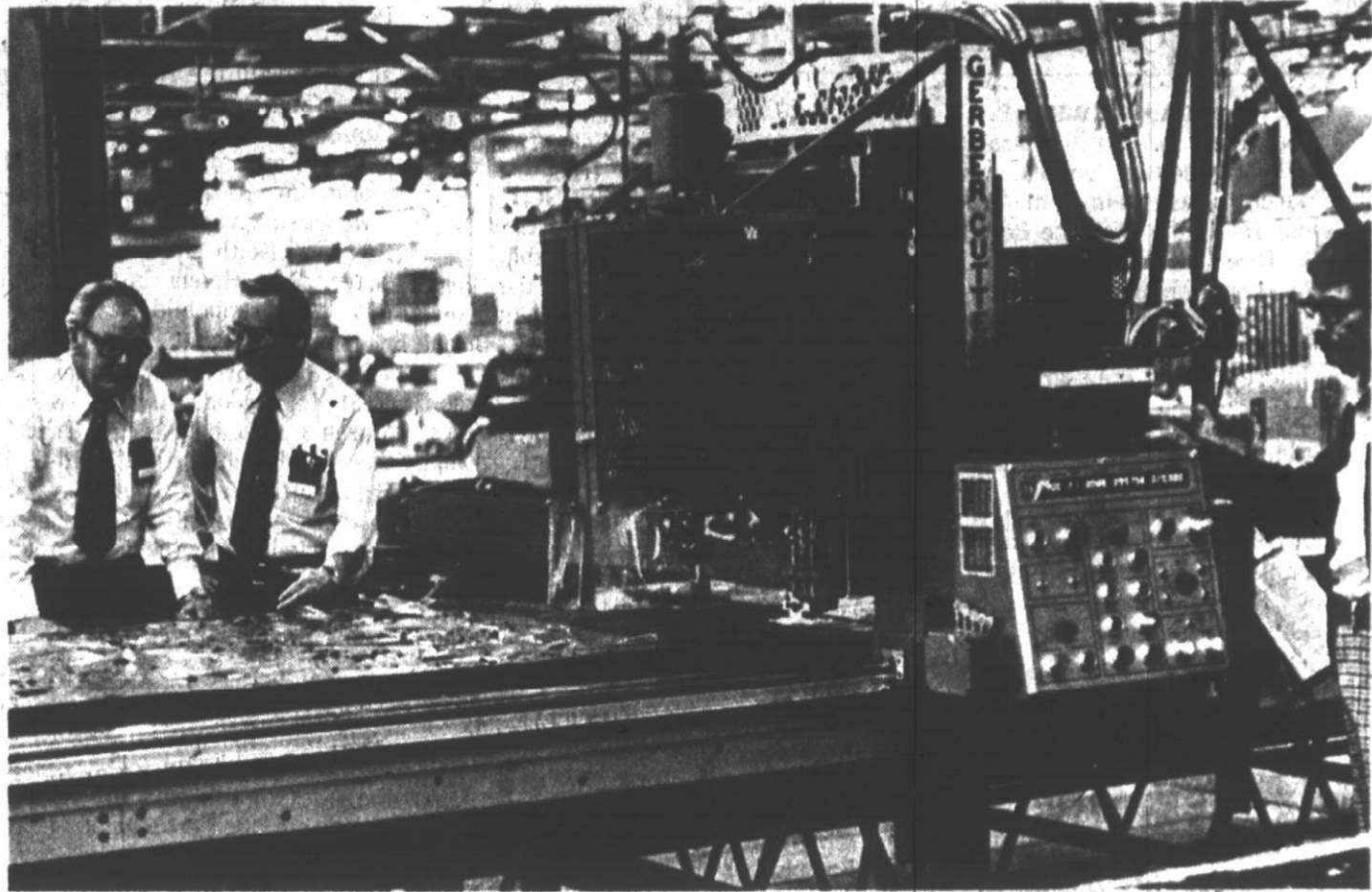
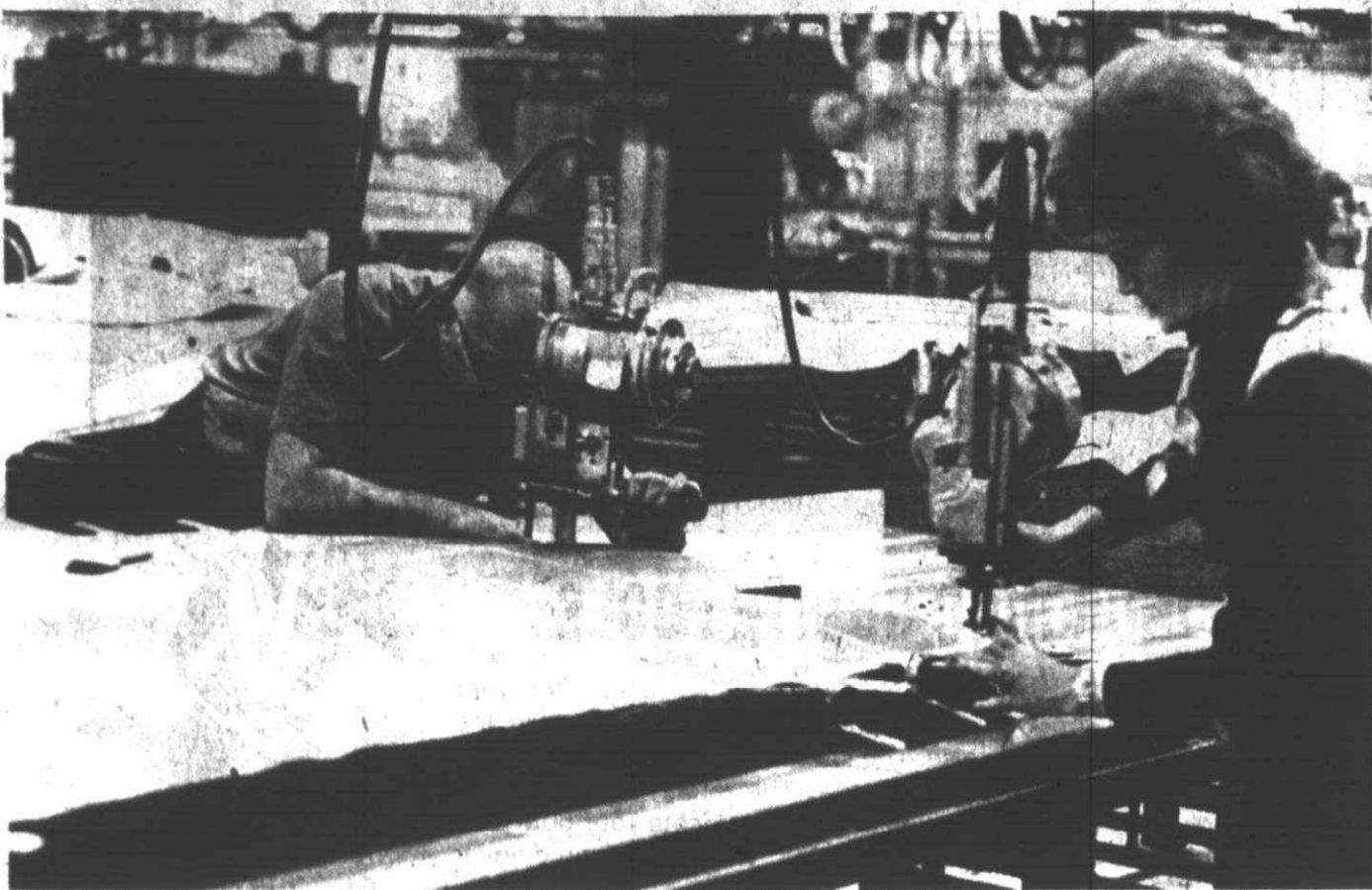

## Man versus machine

### Computers replace handwork, but jobs remain secure

LIVONIA—New cars—lighter, more efficient and economical—will some-

how have to be made attractive to the potential consumer. Because manufacturers will not be able to depend upon splashes of

chrome, startling grills and frills on the outside of cars, automotive interiors are where much of the new populace will be found.

One plant sure to be affected by the new search for status will be General Motors' Fisher Body Plant, located on Plymouth just east of Middlebelt in Livonia.

It is probably the largest trim plant in the world, according to plant manager Harger Green, a Plymouth resident. With 1.2 million square feet of interior work space, the plant is one of the largest GM plants.

But more important, operations within the plant are slowly, but dramatically becoming computerized.

#### New wrinkle

To be sure the sewing machines with intent women stitching cloth and vinyl still are there, adding style and strength to the myriad fabrics making up seat cushions and interior door panels.

But there is a new wrinkle in the upholstery—IBM "System Seven" and

Gerber console computers are used to control four gigantic Gerber cutters.

Cutting used to be done by hand cutters (some still is). Much as a seamstress does an employee traced a pattern onto the fabric and then cut it out with a hand-operated power cutter.

Later came "cookie cutters," blades shaped to form patterns that were stamped under a 50-ton press.

About 400 different "cookie cutters," had to be stocked in racks and cutter blades kept sharp.

#### Computer cutters

But now all patterns are programmed into the Gerber console, and the signal transmitted by overhead cables to a tape-controlled Gerber Cutter. Instead of an employee's hand manipulating a portable power cutter, the electronic cutter carves out the patterns on command from the console.

The cookie cutter used to penetrate six plies of fabric, either cloth or vinyl. The Gerber cuts through 50

layers of fabric, 2½ inches thick, turning out nearly 25,000 different patterns in slightly more than five hours.

The cookie cutter had used 110 square inches of material to make the same number of patterns requiring only 81 square inches of material if cut on the Gerber.

#### No problems

Use of the Gerber, in effect three months, represents savings of thousands of cubic feet of fabric spread over a year—savings to be passed on to buyers.

"It's a good machine," says Gerber operator Clyde Groat. "Had no problems with it."

Groat, with GM 28 years, needed no special training for the Gerber, just on-the-job experience.

Like Groat, most of the trim plant employees seem to have long seniority. Ironically, computers may assure them of a job until retirement, by adding production flexibility and effi-

ciency as the automobile business looks toward an "industrial revolution" in terms of buyer demands and energy dictates.

#### New economics

"We deal in color," says Green. "We're very conscious of the necessity of providing less weight in cars while maintaining comfort. When we replaced seat cushion springs with foam molding, we cut off about 25 pounds."

Style favorites have changed, too, according to Plant Engineer Bob Hlavin. Cheap fabrics that look expensive are helping GM keep costs down. Vinyl has replaced leather, and can even be colored to look like rosewood. Chrome is no longer chrome, but simulated. Cloth is making a comeback as more durable and colorful cloth materials are developed.

"But," says Green, "we've just scratched the surface of things to come. It's a new ball game."

"You have to live life to love life, and love life to live it."

Also David Anderson of Plymouth, Robbie Clarke of Northville and Doris Heipel of Westland.

The play opens with George Gibbs and Emily Webb—still child playmates who are neighbors. As they grow up their interest turns to romance. Bits of humor and tragedy run throughout the play.

HELPING the audience understand the details surrounding each situation and introducing each character is the stage manager played by Vorbeck. His narration sets many of the scenes. Besides

the basic background the drama requires very few stage aids, says Rudick.

"Our Town" is basically a drama about life and could be the story of just about any small community, says Rudick.

"It has audience appeal because of its unconventional presentation, and its simplicity, sincerity and understanding. It's a substantial story about substantial folks."

Friday and Saturday performances of "Our Town" will be at 8 p.m., and Sundays at 7 p.m. General admission is \$2, and \$1 for Schoolcraft students and senior adult students. Tickets will be available at the door.

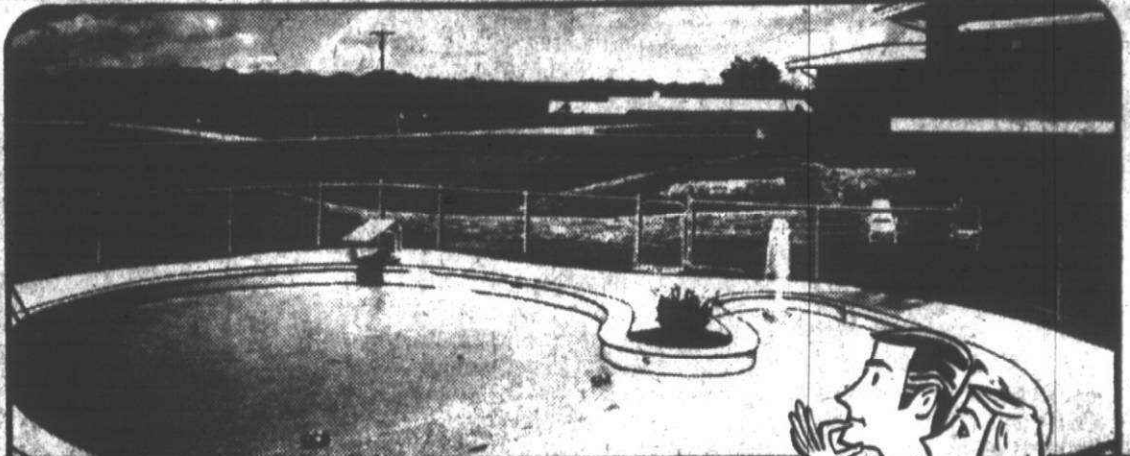

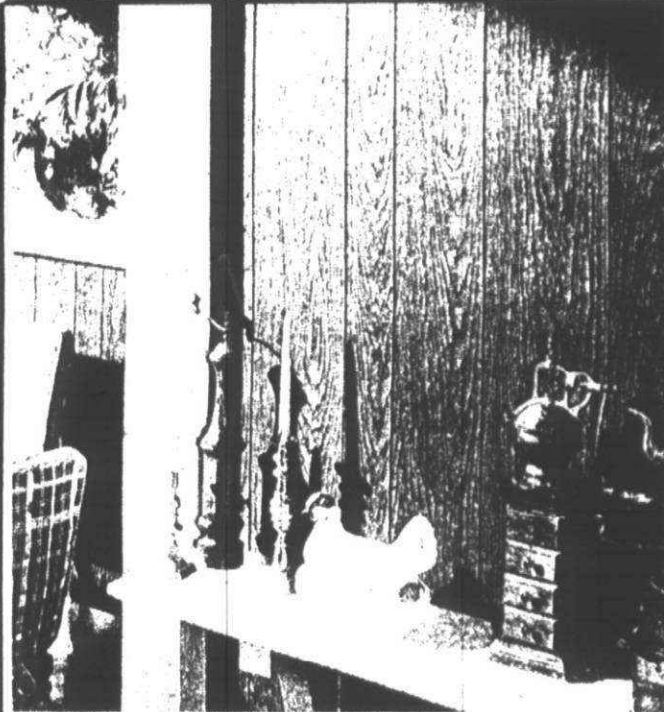

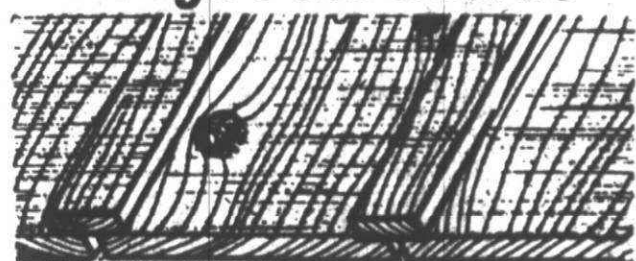

# Theater offers newcomers a spot on stage

In the entertainment world no matter what happens, "the show must go on." And in the true spirit of the theater the Plymouth Theater Guild let it go on, despite the fact it lost one of its lead actors a week before opening night.

The group's recent production "All My Sons," an Arthur Miller drama, was supposed to feature Andy Hruska as Joe Keller. Hruska became ill and was unable to perform but director Tom Hinks took over and delivered a fine performance.

"The director has to be versatile," said Hinks. "This type of situation show just how versatile he has to be."

**THE DRAMA** was the guild's second offering of the 1974-75 and gave many new guild members a chance to show their talents.

Set in post World War II suburban

**America, the play illustrates many conflicts surrounding the Keller family.**

Larry, the oldest son, was supposedly missing in action and presumed dead by all but his mother, Kate Keller, played by Irene Troty.

Mrs. Kefler refuses to accept this verdict and assumes that Larry will come home some day.

Mrs. Troth made her first appearance on stage since her high school days. She seemed right as the loving and devoted mother, not giving up on her son.

Kate's husband, Joe, owns a manufacturing company that produced several hundred defective airplane parts for the Army which resulted in the deaths of 21 pilots.

Keller's partner was eventually charged with negligence and went to jail. Keller escaped prosecution, but is still suspected of having a hand in it by many neighbors.

year-old Keller well. He deserves praise for his last-minute acceptance of a major and difficult role.

Keller seems to be leading a comfortable life as the play opens. But the bubble bursts when Anne, played by Carole McNulty, the daughter of his jailed partner and Larry's old girlfriend, arrives. She is there at the invitation of Keller's youngest son, Chris.

Anne's appearance reminds Kate and Joe Keller of some unpleasant times in their lives. Kate, now more than ever, feels Larry's coming home, and Joe is careful to avoid the airplane issue.

Ray Douglas portrays Chris Keller and, for his first theater performance, does a remarkable job.

Chris had always believed his father's side of the story, but as the play progresses he begins to see things in a different light. At the end he is torn between the love he once felt for his father, and what he considers moral justice.

**THE KELLER**—household falls apart. Joe and Kate have done an adequate job at living pretentious lives, but the truth is finally uncovered and it is too much for them to handle. Keller is revealed as the weak man unable to cope with his son's rejection and unable to face the consequences—confessing to the persecutor.

Kate also receives a shock. Her son Larry had read about the bad parts in a newspaper article shortly before flying his last mission. He couldn't accept the fact his father would place a government contract over human life.

Larry wrote Anne a letter saying he wouldn't live through this. Forcing Kate to face reality, Anne after so many years decides to let her know the truth.

Miller's works are an acting challenge. The drama is so intense they require great skill. The Plymouth production was staged with many theater newcomers but was good for the most part. Despite a few mechanical flaws

it was an enjoyable presentation and a successful debut for many guild

players, who will hopefully continue in community theater.

# Don't be overly rushed to make April 15 deadline

For Americans, spring is that time of year when their fancy lightly turns to thoughts of love—and income tax.

Michigan residents have at least two kinds of income tax to pay—state and Federal; some pay city taxes as well.

Completing tax forms taxes the mind, however, and many are content to get it over with as soon as possible by using the short form, or turning the chore over to an agency or a certified public accountant.

THE MICHIGAN Association of Certified Public Accountants warns, however, that haste could very well make waste as taxpayers hurry to beat the April 15 deadline.

William L. Matthews, 15356 Ellen Drive, Livonia, offers a list of deductions and "tax breaks" that often go unnoticed by the middle and lower income taxpayer.

Matthews, CPA and partner in the Southfield accounting firm of Plante and Moran, stresses that these tax breaks are not limited to businessmen or corporation presidents or athletes, but can provide tax relief for the working man or woman, blue or white collar.

Federal relief includes the following:

- Casualty loss deduction. If you're involved in an auto accident and your car is not insured, you can deduct the cost of repairs in excess of \$100. The

deduction also applies to fire, storm, theft and flooded basements.

- Transportation expenses. Gasoline tax is deductible, based upon a government table that takes into account annual mileage and allows nine cents a mile (last year this allowance was only seven cents a mile).

- Business use of automobile. If you used your car as part of your job, you can deduct 15 cents a mile this year. In 1973 the deduction was only 12 cents a mile. For mileage exceeding 15,000, you can deduct 10 cents a mile.

- Moving expenses. If you changed jobs and had to move to a new location you can deduct the actual expenses involved, including any loss you may have taken in selling your house, and fees involved in the sale of the house.

- If you purchased a new car, boat, airplane, mobile home or built your own home, you can deduct the sales tax paid on these items on your federal tax return.

- Household maintenance. If you need a baby-sitter or nurse to care for a dependent person living in your home, you can deduct the expense from your federal taxes. You must be gainfully employed and the dependent child must be under 15 years of age. Or, the deduction can apply to a dependent spouse as well. Expenses up to \$400 a month are allowed.

- Union dues are deductible, including those paid by school teachers.

- Political contributions may be claimed either as a deduction or credit.

- If you were unable to work and collected insurance payments, you are allowed to receive up to \$100 a week tax-free.

- If you donate your time to a charitable organization, you can claim seven cents a mile to get to and from the organization. You can also claim seven cents a mile to get to and from a hospital to receive medical treatment.

- If you donate furniture or clothing to a charitable organization, you can deduct the fair market value of the items.

- If you paid alimony, it's deductible. The child support received by a divorced woman is not taxable, but alimony received is taxable income.

- Dividends paid on life insurance is not taxable, but the interest on the dividends is taxable.

SOCIAL SECURITY payments are not taxable, nor are unemployment compensation benefits. However, Supplemental Unemployment Benefits (SUB) are taxable.

- Employment agency fees are deductible. If you found a job through an agency, you can deduct the amount charged by the agency.

- Medical and dental expenses exceeding three per cent of your gross adjusted income are deductible.

- Finance charges on revolving charge accounts are deductible.

- Medical insurance premiums are deductible up to 1/2 the cost, not to exceed \$150.

- If you must set up your own retirement program, you're allowed a deduction of up to \$1,500.

SOME OFTEN overlooked tax

breaks in Michigan's income tax include the following:

- Homestead property taxes. An exemption of up to \$1,500 is allowed. This represents an increase over the 1973 tax year, when the maximum exemption was only \$1,250. The exemption is also allowable to renters.

- Sales tax credit for households earning less than \$15,000.

- Pension and retirement payments received are deductible from the state tax, up to \$7,500 per person, \$10,000 per couple. The federal government taxes them, however.

- Senior citizens, veterans, widows, blind persons and paraplegics can claim special credits on their state income tax by using Form M1040CR2.

- Alimony payments paid are deductible from state taxes.

WHAT IF YOU goof in figuring out your income tax?

The federal government uses a computer to check each return and if you overpaid the computer will increase your refund.

If you discover that, after mailing in your return, you made a mistake, you can file an amended return using Form 1040X.

"Most persons are hesitant about calling the Internal Revenue Service," says Matthews, "but they're really very helpful." According to him, it is far better to itemize deductions on the long form rather than taking the standard deduction.

And if you use the services of accountants, lawyers, or tax specialists, the fee charged is deductible, too.

# This African safari lasted 5 months

When Denise Thibau of Plymouth took a safari up the length of Africa, she'd had more experience as a world traveler than as a camper.

Her travel had included a jaunt to Rome two years ago and last year a trip around the world with stops in places like London, Frankfurt, Athens, Africa, Bangkok, Hong Kong and Hawaii.

Her camping experience? A Girl Scout overnight a few years back. But Miss Thibau has added quite a few roughing-in credentials to her travel record.

Her five-month safari included travel in a four-wheel drive bus, sleeping in a tent in assorted kinds of African weather and a seven-week detour to London.

She figures the trip cost her \$2,500—air fare was low because her father, Frank Thibau, is an airline employee—and she'll be paying it off for quite a while. But it was worth every minute, she says.

MISS THIBAU'S trip north through Africa began in Johannesburg, South Africa, on Sept. 10. She had left Plymouth a week earlier.

Forty travelers in two buses owned by Encounter Overland, a London-based travel company, began the journey out of Johannesburg. Fourteen of them, in one bus, pulled into London Jan. 31, and Miss Thibau flew right home.

But back to South Africa for this Plymouth traveler's mini-log of an exciting trip.

"WE STARTED OFF with just 30

pounds of luggage each," she said, "including a sleeping bag. The company furnished tents, ground stretchers to sleep on, things like mosquito netting and food, mostly canned and dehydrated.

"We split up the camping chores and took turns cooking and doing the dishes and clean-up. We did most of the cooking outside on a gas stove, and usually stopped in places where there were toilet and shower facilities."

The group of travelers included people from many countries—England, New Zealand, Australia, Germany, Italy, Holland, Switzerland. Miss Thibau and a friend, Dennis Hendricks, were the only Americans.

The overland buses with their canvas roofs for wide viewing headed first into Rhodesia where a memorable stop was beside Victoria Falls.

"I used to live in Buffalo, so I know Niagara Falls well," Miss Thibau reported. "Victoria is more impressive, much higher, and natural, no railings and concession stands."

That stop also included some interesting eating, she said. Elephant steak (very good) and crocodile meat (a little too salty).

**LEAVING RHODESIA,** a bit of passport trouble caused the first complications.

"Many of the people on the safari had been working in South Africa," Miss Thibau explained, "so their passports had been stamped by officials there. South Africa's racial policies make the country not very well liked in other African nations, so some refused to accept passports with the South Africa stamp."

She had been careful to avoid that problem, she said, but for the travelers whose passports were refused, the buses made a detour to Lusaka for new ones.

Next came stops in Kafue, a game park where the travelers could see many African animals, an encampment on the Indian Ocean at Dar es Salaam, where everyone bought wood carvings and elephant hair bracelets, and then on to Kilimanjaro.

"I had climbed almost to the top when I was in Africa last year," Miss Thibau said, "so this time I decided to watch the others. I did go up to 15,000 feet, though. Several of our group made it to the spot near the top that's 18,635 feet above sea level. Some day I'm going to go all the way—19,340 feet."

**THE TWO BUSES** moved on to Nairobi where everyone enjoyed drug stores and restaurant meals in what was supposed to be a stop of a few days. It stretched to three weeks.

They finally went on to Lake Nakuru, which Miss Thibau described as "pink with flamingos", and to a primitive Masai village, and then to the Ngorongoro Crater game park.

And then occurred an unscheduled detour in Miss Thibau's adventures.

"One of the buses left Nairobi a day or so ahead of the other," she reported. "I waited for the second, because I had a toothache and wanted to get to a dentist."

"But a couple of days out, the second bus broke down and couldn't be repaired."

Most of the passengers elected to end their travels right there and head for home, she said. Miss Thibau wanted to continue, but there was no way the travel company could get her to the other bus until it reached Kano, Nigeria.

"So they flew me to London to wait until I could make connections," she said. "It turned out to be seven weeks. I enjoyed being in London, and I worked for the company to make ex-

penses. The only thing is, I missed seeing the Pygmies. I'll have to get to that part of Africa next time."

MISS THIBAU rejoined the group in time to cross the Sahara desert.

"It wasn't what I expected a desert crossing to be," she said. "Dry, but we had plenty of water, and warm in the daytime, but only a couple of times when it got really hot."

Nights were very cold, she added, and that's when she and the other travelers purchased warm djellaba robes, like the Africans wear in that area.

There was a chance to ride a camel at Tamanaasset and some mountain scenery near the Haggar-Massif range, and then the group headed on to Morocco.

"The farther north we went, the colder it became," Miss Thibau remembered. "The tour was by this time two months behind schedule."

**SHOPPING FOR SOUVENIRS,** fun all the way, was especially interesting in Morocco and Fez, she said. "You always had to bargain, and we did a lot of trading at the end as our money was running low. I sold two shirts to get money to buy a pair of trousers like the Arabs wear."

The bus went to Ceuta, a town near Gibraltar, for ferrying across the straits into Spain.

"There we camped by the police station," Miss Thibau said. "They said they wanted to keep an eye on us. You didn't argue about things like that."

After the ferry crossing, the bus went on to Madrid, where five of the passengers came down with hepatitis. "They probably had picked it up back in the desert," Miss Thibau said, "and the rest of us worried, but no one else got it." The five were flown to London.

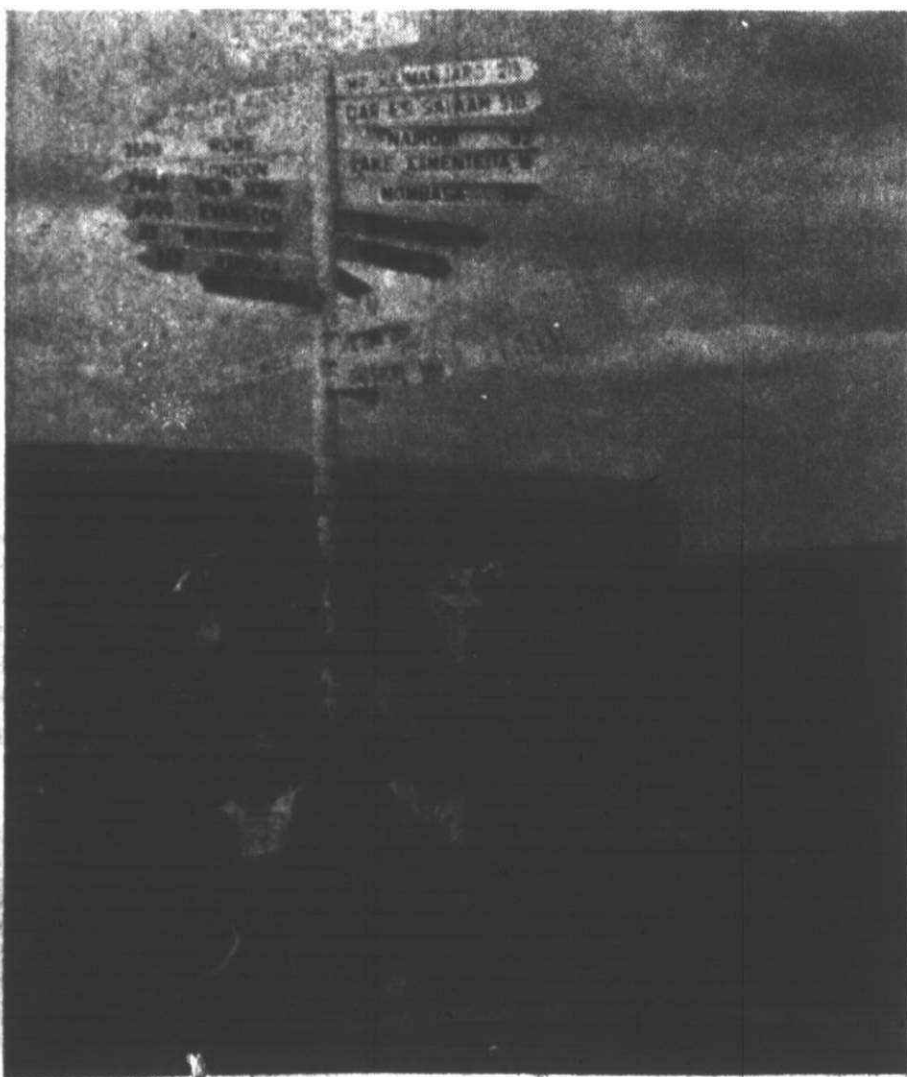
From Madrid, the bus made fast time through Spain and France, and eventually ferried into England from Bilgine to Dover. The 14 travelers remaining chugged finally into London's Victoria Station.

**BACK HOME,** Miss Thibau is catching up on family news, considering signing up for some courses at Schoolcraft College—she's already studied Spanish there—and, understandably, looking for work.

"I worked two years for a doctor in Plymouth," she said, "but now I'd really love to get something with a travel agency."

This 1972 graduate of Ladywood High School has another ambition. Before she turns 21 in April and loses the youth travel privileges of the air transportation she has enjoyed, she'd like to get in one more trip.

"I really love traveling," she explained.

## Thermography exams set by Family Y

Thermography examinations, one of the methods used to detect breast cancer, will be offered in the Livonia Family Y, 14255 Stark, on Tuesday and Wednesday, March 18 and 19, from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. both days.

The examinations, to be given by Thermo-Scan, a private firm headquartered in St. Clair Shores, will cost \$20 and will take approximately 20 minutes.

Thermography is a process that uses infra-red images to show conditions that might indicate the beginnings of breast cancer. In complete examinations, it is used in conjunction with mammography, or x-ray of the breast, and physical examination.

Dr. Philip Hoekstra, biochemist who heads Thermo-Scan, said thermography can detect cancer earlier than palpitation and can safely be used more often than mammography.

He said that to avoid confusion in reading results, one basis for criticism of the process on the part of the medical profession, they always are sent to the physician specified by the woman taking the examination.

# New Christian bookstore open in Plymouth

For a long time Dennis Collins believed Plymouth needed an interdenominational Christian bookstore.

But it took a meeting between Collins and Ron Craddock, another Plymouth resident, to make the dream a reality. Joy Bookstore, 963 Ann Arbor Trail, is the result, and it is now doing a brisk business in books and other religious items.

"Originally I used to sell Bibles and religious books at a table set up in different churches," said Collins. "My wife and I used to travel around in our spare time looking for a possible location of a bookstore."

But one day he was approached by Craddock, who like himself, is a Ford Co. employee — Collins is a supervisor and Craddock an engineer. But the talk was not of automotive matters.

"HE TOLD ME he liked what I was doing at the book table," continued Collins. "He said he recently sold some land and had promised the Lord that when he sold it, he would look for a Christian investment."

"I said fine, and invited him home to talk about a bookstore."

Collins recalled that he had prayed about his need for an investor two or three weeks before Craddock approached him.

"The response in Plymouth has been very gratifying," he noted. "The churches got behind us. Pastor

Douglas Rutledge and Pastor Glenn Lainge of the Calvary Baptist Church dedicated the store at the grand opening.

"Rev. Paul Thompson, former pastor of the First Baptist Church of Plymouth, along with assistant pastor Denny Metzger encouraged us."

In addition to selling a variety of objects, the store sponsors a prayer meeting led by Craddock every Saturday at 8:30 a.m.

JOY BOOKSTORE deals primarily in Bibles, religious books and Sunday school material. It sells books for children such as the "Children's Living Bible," the "Taylor Bible Story Book" and Arch talking books, each of which includes a record.

Cassettes and records featuring gospel singers Anita Bryant, Doug Oldham and Bill Gather are also on sale, along with choruses such as the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.

Records and cassettes also make available the works of Christian teachers Hal Lindsey, Keith Miller and Josh McDowell.

Gifts imported from Jerusalem also are available. Olive wood carvings, mother-of-pearl jewelry, postcards and Christmas cards may be purchased.

Salespersons at the store are Eloise Herfirth and Cheryl Eddlemon. It is open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday, with a 9 p.m. closing on Fridays.

## Most of pledges paid in '74

Ninety-five per cent of the contributions pledged to the 1974 Archdiocesan Development Fund had been paid by the first of the year, according to Charles Starrs, director of the office of development and church support of the Archdiocese of Detroit.

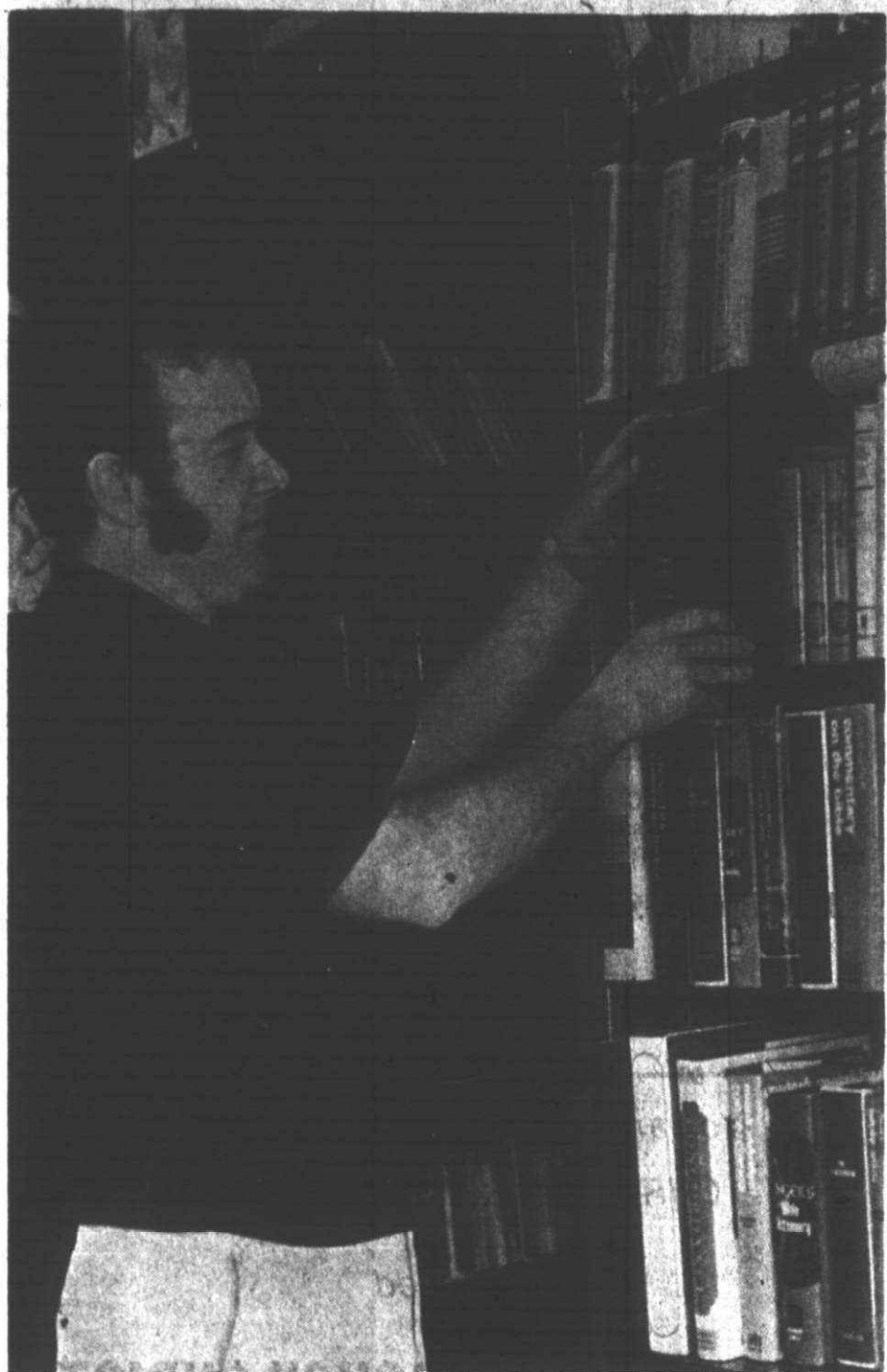
At that time \$1,474,712 had been contributed in this annual appeal which supports religious, educational and charitable activities throughout a six-county area.

"A review of all 334 parishes in the archdiocese shows that 295 parishes have collected 90 per cent or more of their pledges, and that of those parishes, 69 have reached 100 per cent collected," said Starrs.

He added that the 1974 development appeal had two special projects. These were an advertising campaign to promote alternatives to abortion and the creation of a partial scholarship fund for students wishing to attend Catholic high schools.

"I am happy to report that we have met our original goal for the scholarship fund which was to set aside \$100,000 for the fund," said Starrs. "Thus far, the fund has been able to help 55 students who are attending 46 different Catholic high schools."

The northwest Wayne area has paid 94 per cent of its pledge, or \$101,266. The western Wayne area has already contributed 93 per cent of its pledge, or \$36,387.
