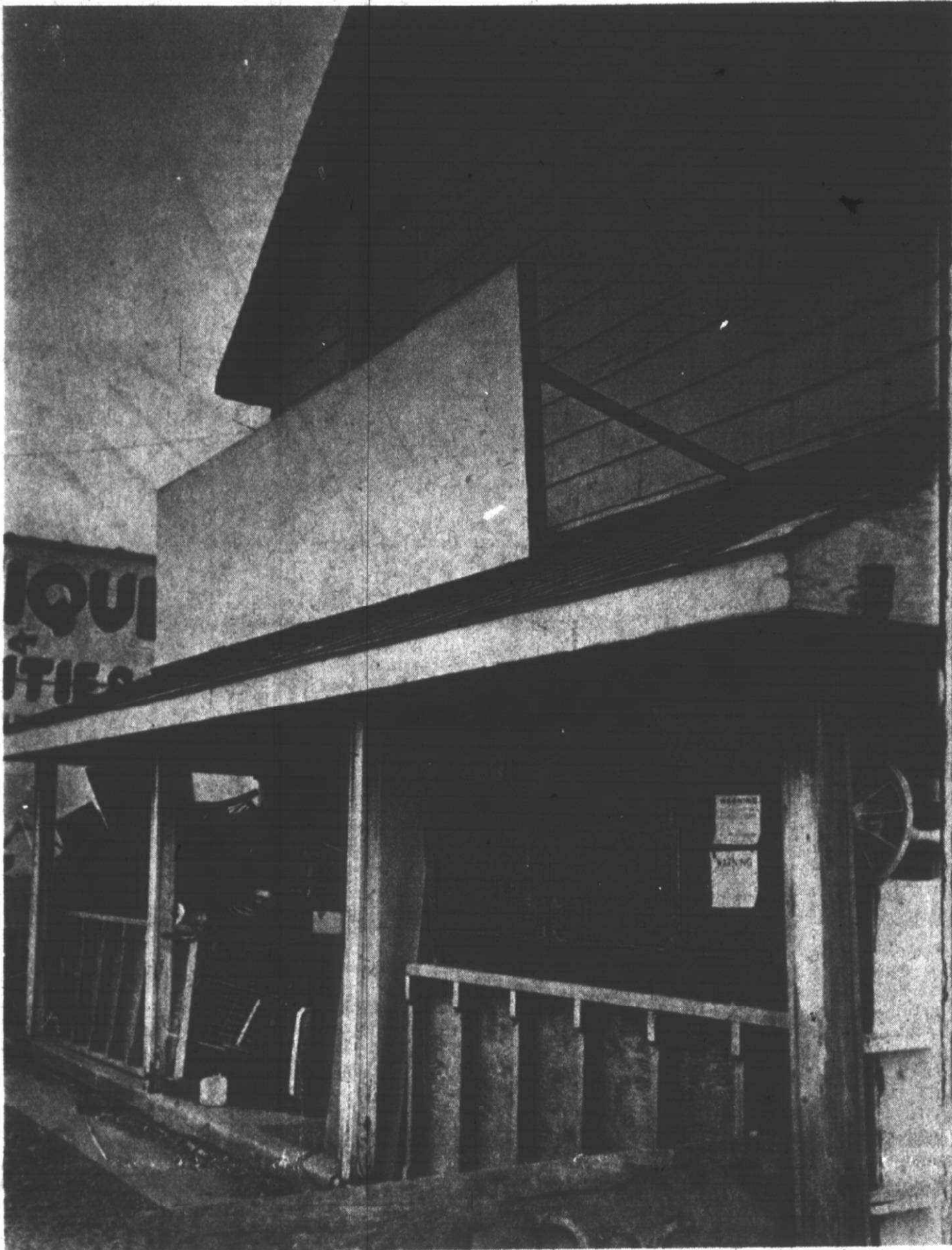

## Intergovernmental group looks at joint recreation

The Plymouth-Canton area is taking another stab at an areawide recreation authority, despite an attempt that fell flat on its face last year.

The intergovernmental council, composed of representatives from the city of Plymouth, the Plymouth Community School District and Plymouth, Canton, Salem and Superior townships, agreed last week to start the ball rolling, after recently placing the areawide recreational concept at the top of its priority list.

The group unanimously approved Canton Township Supervisor Robert Greenstein's proposal to ask each community to appoint an elected official to a joint recreation commission and ask local recreational directors to act as advisors.

Charged with implementing a pilot recreational program and investigating the possibilities of a long-range program, commission members will appoint residents from each municipality to serve on the recreational commission as they deem necessary.

"I think we should try a pilot program for a year and see the results," said Greenstein. "Perhaps after that we'd know what we were talking about. It's hard for us to speculate now."

"We're all very interested in Canton Township," Greenstein added, "and we'd like to see a program get off the ground, so it could go into effect for this summer season."

The recreational authority, as envisioned by intergovernmental representatives, will open up all facilities and programs in the area to the general public, regardless of city and township boundaries.

In addition, the authority could pool recreational personnel and part-time help in cost-saving efforts.

"It would seem to me the program would assimilate all the people we have now," said Greenstein. "I wouldn't consider lopping off any recreational programs from the areawide program, unless they would be something only to the interest of Canton residents."

Plymouth City Commissioner Norbert Battermann wants to keep dollar signs from the recreational authority's discussion for the present.

Although Greenstein kept monetary issues from his motion to establish the authority, he said, "If their charge is not investigation of expenditures, you're going to hamstring them from the beginning."

A proposed recreational authority, that would have included the City of Plymouth, the Plymouth Community School District and Plymouth and Canton townships, went awry in 1973, after the Plymouth City Commission opted out of the proposed contact.

According to Battermann, the main reasons for the city's action focused on inequities in facilities and the authority's proposed one-year contract.

Although representative of the intergovernmental council have agreed to start anew and avoid rehabilitating the problems of the defunct authority, Battermann expressed hopes the intergovernmental council's proposal will work.

"I think if it's approached on a more solid foundation, we'd be willing to accept it," Battermann said. "We already have a recreation program that satisfies people in the city. I think there's a good chance of a recreation authority working, if there's an advantage to the city."

Intergovernmental representatives pointed out the recreational facilities within their municipal boundaries and

the economic advantages of pooling facilities, programs and personnel.

The school district, noted Plymouth School Board Treasurer Thomas Yack, has numerous recreational facilities.

"We're just not using them," said

## 'Tele-squirt' is welcomed in Canton

CANTON—"It's a great big rascal," commented Township Clerk John Flodin. It's called a telescopic squirt and it is the latest addition to the township's fire department.

The department received the new engine Wednesday, six months after it was supposed to be delivered, but Fire Chief Mel Paulun is most pleased with it.

He said, "It's got all the latest improvements, it'll help us make quicker rescues and improve our fire fighting ability."

The "tele-squirt" offers several innovations. It is a pumper, yet has a 50 foot ladder. The ladder is operated hydraulically and can be run by either the truck motor or battery.

A nozzle is attached to the end of the ladder and the water can be aimed without the aid of a fireman on the ladder. At full extension, the nozzle will put out 1,000 gallons of water a minute. At ground level, the truck will pump 1,200 gallons a minute.

"If we ordered one today it would cost \$125,000," said Paulun. This one costs \$75,000."

Flodin explained, "Lead time on ordering a fire engine is substantial. We ordered this one two years ago, and another several months after because we heard there was going to be a price rise. The second one (which is identical) will be here next January."

He added, "You have to purchase and add to the fire equipment over

## Townships lose in road patrol suit

PLYMOUTH—If Plymouth and Canton Townships want police protection they'll have to pay for it.

That was the opinion handed down by Circuit Court Judge Thomas J. Foley Thursday in granting a motion for dismissal of a suit against the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and Sheriff William Lucas.

The suit was filed by seven Wayne County township governments including Plymouth, Canton, Northville, Huron, Brownstown, Van Buren and Sumpter. It charged the present level of protection provided by the Sheriff's Road Patrol was inadequate and the number of deputies should be augmented.

THE BACKGROUND is that for several years there have been complaints from township residents, especially Plymouth, that the police protection is inadequate.

And for just as many years the township supervisors and members of the board of trustees have asserted the protection provided by the road patrol and the Michigan State Police is more than sufficient.

During the past three or four years the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has been threatening to cut off the road patrol services on the grounds that the townships involved should pay their share of the bill.

It was that threat which brought the suit. The defendants asked the Circuit Court for accelerated or summary judgment which Judge Foley granted in his dismissal order.

THE PLAINTIFFS sought a declaratory judgment directing the Board of Commissioners (Wayne County Board of Commissioners and Board of Supervisors are one and the same in the opinion) to provide funds for the purpose of maintaining the road patrol at its present strength or at greater strength than presently maintained.

In his opinion Judge Foley said legislation provides for the number of deputy sheriffs, and gives the Board of Supervisors the power to designate the number of employees the sheriff may appoint and the discretion and authority to limit or expand the funds appropriated therefore.

He explains it was the general language which the plaintiffs used as authority for the proposition that the sheriff is under legal duty to furnish a road patrol of 28 deputies or greater and the Board of Commissioners is under legal duty to provide funds for such an operation.

The judge added that this theory is without authority. "No authority is cited and none can be found imposing on the sheriff the duty to patrol the

county or township other than in connection with special police protection as written into the statutes."

HE CITES a 1972 decision in which the court stated, "It is the duty of all sheriffs to maintain law and order in parts of the county which the sheriff knows are not being adequately policed by local authorities which calls for the exercise of a reasonable degree of activity and diligence on the part of the sheriff to keep informed of the conditions of his county, but does not require him to patrol all roads and highways in the county regularly."

The judge wrote of a statute which

states, "The township board of a township may adopt ordinances regulating the public health, safety and general welfare of persons and property."

"It shall enforce the same and may for that purpose employ and establish a police department with full power and authority to enforce all township ordinances and state laws, provided that in the event state laws are to be enforced, such townships shall have a law enforcement unit or may by resolution appropriate funds and call upon the sheriff of the county in which the township is located to provide special police protection."

"It shall be the duty of the sheriff."

## Officials note disappointment

PLYMOUTH—"We have no place to go and no funds to finance a police department" was the comment of Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren and Canton Township's Robert Greenstein after being informed of Circuit Court Judge Thomas Foley's dismissal of their suit against the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and Sheriff William Lucas.

They had been told by an Observer & Eccentric reporter that Judge Foley handed down an opinion that said the townships would have to pay for police protection if they expected to have any.

Both Greenstein and McLaren quickly pointed out that each township had recently gone to the voters for approval of millage to handle the cost of a police department, among other things, and it had been rejected in both communities.

"I am keenly disappointed by this decision," said McLaren. "We have no funds available to finance police protection and the only thing we can do is go back to the people."

"I'll take this matter up with the board at the April 18 meeting and get some kind of a decision then."

"There isn't any way we can afford our own police department," said Greenstein. "If this opinion is allowed to go unchallenged, then there will be some 200,000 persons in the seven areas without effective police protection."

"AS I SEE it, this would involve a minimum cost of \$400,000 for Canton Township with a maximum of around

\$600,000. That means we would have to ask the voters for at least three mills since one mill is worth \$140,000

"This is really a disaster for all of the seven townships. Canton is a charter township with a right to assess five mills for operations, all of the others are townships that can only assess one mill. If we can't afford it, how can they hope to even think of a police department?"

"We will probably discuss the turn of events at our special meeting on Wednesday," Greenstein said.

Plymouth Township Clerk Helen Richardson said it was just a question of how quickly the township would ask the voters for additional millage.

"We just signed a contract with the firemen a few days ago. We didn't grant salary increases to any member of the administration and there isn't anything in our contingency fund."

Mrs. Richardson indicated three mills would have to be used to finance police protection. She said each mill is worth \$170,000 and she figures the police protection would cost at least \$425,000.

"In our last talks with the Plymouth City Manager we were quoted a price of \$575,000 annually for using the police department to take care of our needs. So we know if we have to pay for our police protection, it is going to cost somewhere between \$400,000 and \$575,000."

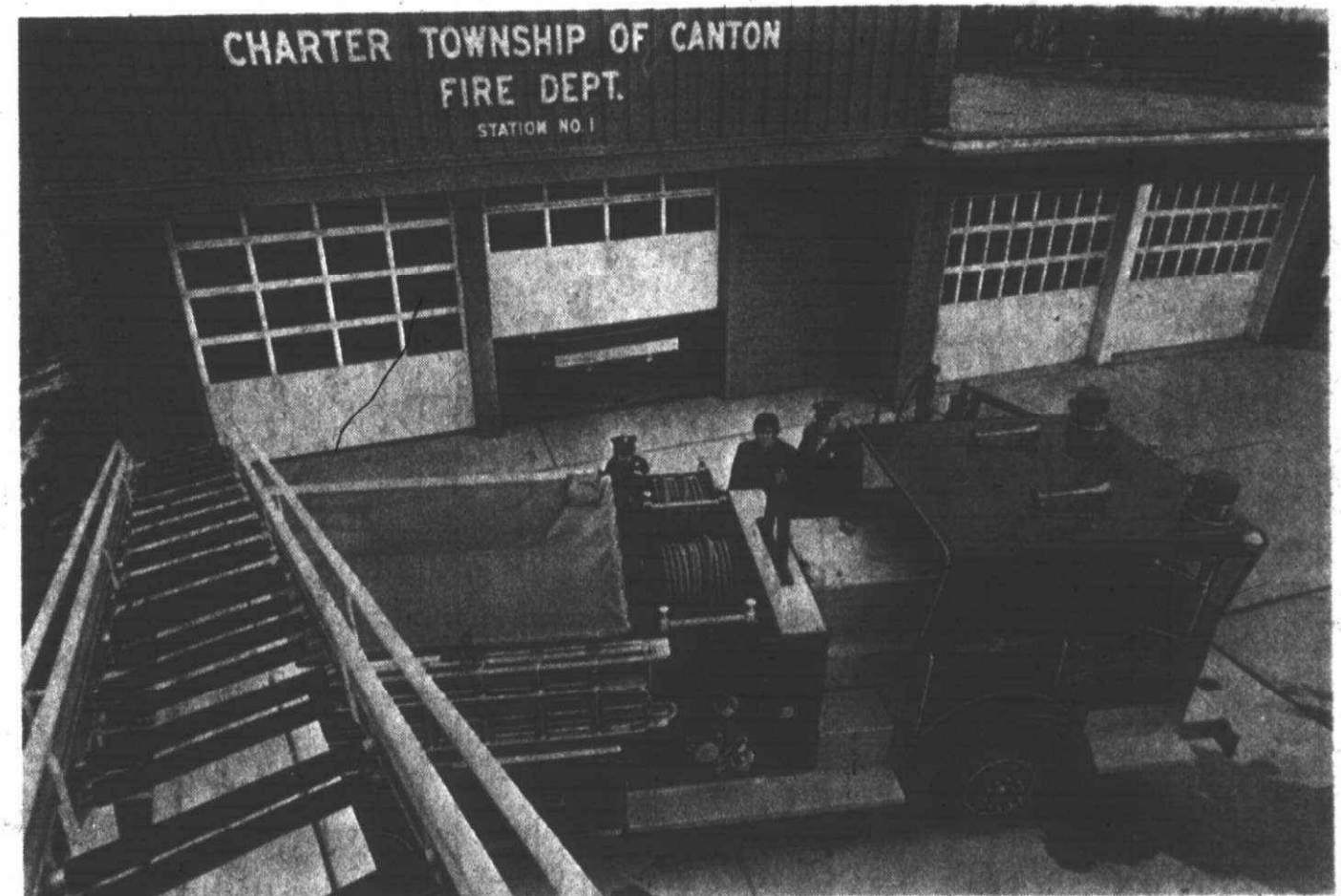

# ACLU opposes reform position

While members of Common Cause (CC) of western Wayne County are gearing up for their petition drive for campaign reform, the American Civil Liberties Union of Michigan (ACLU-M) has adopted a resolution opposing a key point in the CC reform package. ACLU-M is opposed to a requirement which would compel disclosure of the names of contributors to political candidates, committees or parties. It has taken no position on other provisions of the CC campaign.

Public reporting of names, addresses and occupations of all persons who contribute \$50 or more to a campaign is part of the reform proposal submitted by CC of Michigan. CC seeks to have the Legislature adopt a comprehensive campaign reform package; failing that, it plans a petition drive to place it before the electorate in a referendum.

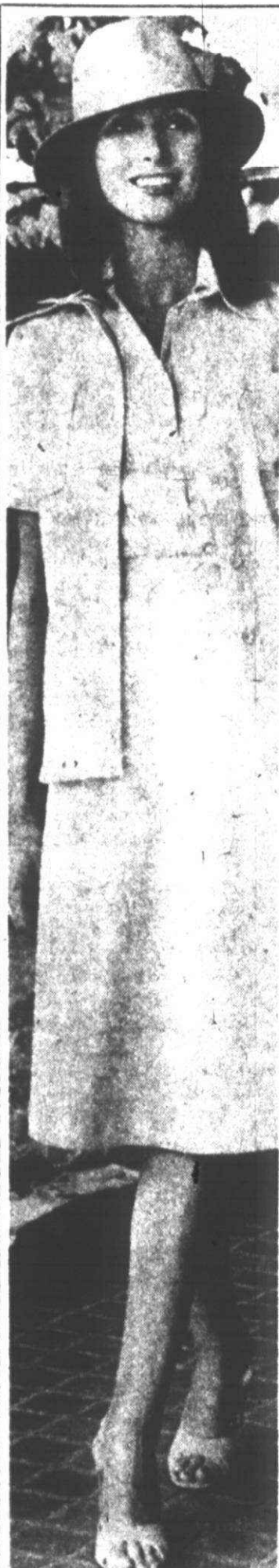

## Austin sets hearing on auto repair

A public hearing on the first set of proposed rules for regulating auto repair facilities in the state will be held Tuesday, April 1, beginning at 9 a.m. in the 13th floor auditorium of the City-County Building in Detroit.

The all-day hearing has been scheduled by Secretary of State Richard H. Austin.

The rules to be considered at this hearing include: definitions of unfair and deceptive practices; definitions of minor and major repair services; details regarding the surety bonds to be required for licensed facilities; and requirements regarding the return of replaced parts to customers.

Austin points out that the hearing will not cover procedures or requirements for registering repair facilities nor for certifying mechanics. Those rules will be considered at later hearings.

The rules must first be considered, Austin said, before his office can begin to accept specific consumer complaints about alleged defective work, deceptive practices, and dishonest pricing in car repair work.

The law sets April 1, 1976—next year—as the date when Austin's office can actually take action on complaints. Austin, however, has been pushing for an earlier starting date.

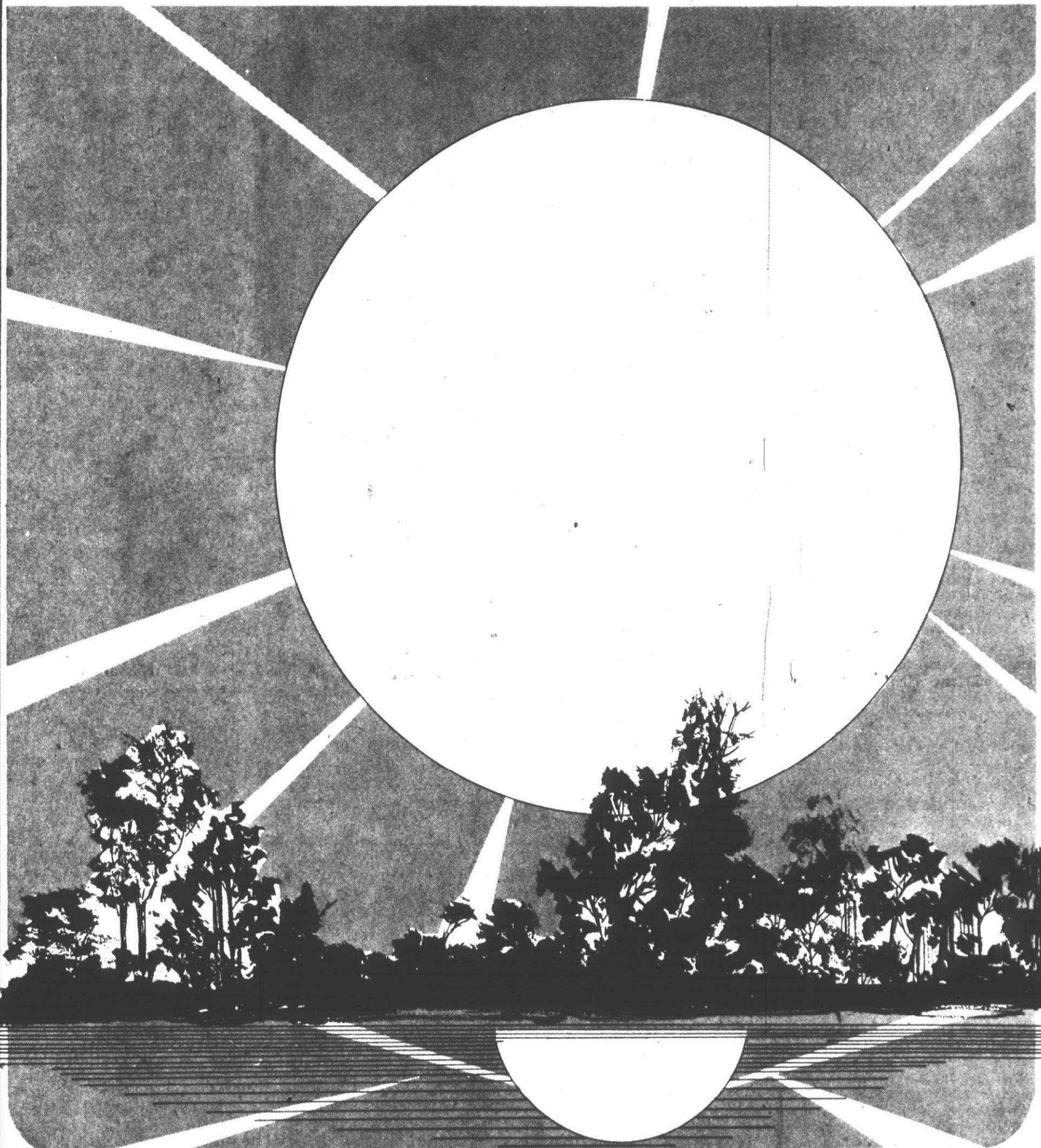

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# Most communities join in airport opposition

A study that could place a new general aviation airport in the Plymouth-Canton area is glueing some local governing bodies together in an opposition fight.

Representatives of the intergovernmental council, composed of representatives from the City of Plymouth, the Plymouth Community School District and Canton, Plymouth, Salem and Superior townships agreed Wednesday to draft an intergovernmental letter opposed to the proposed airport.

The group unanimously agreed to empower Marda Benson, vice president of the Plymouth Community School Board, to draft the letter, modeled after a letter approved by the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees last week, and send the opposition document to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), the Michigan

Aeronautics Commission and the Wayne County Road Commission.

THE LETTER will express the "majority" view of the intergovernmental council, since the City of Plymouth's stand on the proposed airport is "noncommittal," according to Plymouth City Commissioner Norbert Battermann.

"The city doesn't have a strong objection to the airport at this time, not knowing where it would be," Battermann told intergovernmental representatives. "We feel any airport in this area would not be too close in proximity to the city. It could probably only help the city."

Battermann, however, held no objections to the intergovernmental letter, as long as it expressed the "majority" view of intergovernmental members.

The airport is proposed for a still undetermined site in northwestern Wayne County, southwestern Oakland County or northeastern Washtenaw County. With runways up to 5,000 feet, the airport would accommodate small corporate jets and other privately owned aircraft.

THE WAYNE County Road Commission, which the FAA has charged with the airport issue, will hire a consulting firm to conduct a study on the airport's location, after it examines reactions from local governing bodies, received by an April 1 deadline.

But, if local governing bodies generate enough opposition, the study may not be funded, according to Robert Larson, director of transportation programs for the Wayne County Road Commission.

The intergovernmental council directed representatives at its last meet-

ing to glean the feelings of their governing bodies on the issue.

At that time, Plymouth Township Trustee Richard Gornick told intergovernmental representatives that he and two township residents were drafting a letter of opposition on their township's behalf.

CANTON TOWNSHIP Supervisor Robert Greenstein criticized Plymouth Township's independent action on the matter and the City of Plymouth's stand on the airport issue.

"It seems to me there are two cases of selfishness here," Greenstein said. Addressing Battermann and the city's noncommittal stand, he added, "That attitude is certainly not something the rest of us expected. Just because the city is surrounded by other districts seems no reason not take a position beneficial to other areas."

"Even if we can't always expect unanimity, we can at least expect an attempt at it," Greenstein said. "I would like more of an attempt in the future."

Battermann responded, "I was surprised the city commission took this stand."

Gornick defended his township. "We decided to write this letter, before this group even met."

Plymouth Township's letter, drafted by Gornick and residents Irving Rozian and James Kratzer, was sent to the FAA, the Wayne County Road Commission and local legislators last week.

THE LETTER cited these reasons among others for the township's opposition to the airport:

- Local residents will provide about one-third of the funding for the proposed airport. Local funding would create a basic inequity, since only a small fraction of local residents would take advantage of the airport's recreational flying opportunities.
- The airport at Willow Run is now used at a fraction of its capacity.
- The airport would encourage recreational flying and non-essential gasoline consumption, which is incongruous with national energy priorities.
- Long-range population forecasts predict a population decline for Wayne County.
- Plans for the proposed airport disregard master plans and planning goals of local communities.
- The proposed airport would accelerate the removal of agricultural lands from gainful productivity.
- The Wayne County Road Commission should view hard-surface roads as a higher priority than a new airport.

Replied Berg, "He has not studied it in detail and we would like to see what (William) Sempliner says."

Berg later commented, "We had an attorney offer his services. We couldn't pay one. But he wasn't able to study it thoroughly."

PLYMOUTH—The city commission recently proclaimed the week of April 21 through April 26 as "Plymouth Opera Week."

The Michigan Opera Theatre will stay in the Plymouth community that week, conducting workshops, demonstrations and presenting programs for schools and organizations.

The opera company will present "The Barber of Seville" on Saturday, April 26, with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra and a male chorus of 20 residents at Plymouth Salem High School.

The opera week project will be jointly sponsored by the Plymouth Community Arts Council and the Plymouth Symphony.

## Public hearing to decide consumer council fate

CANTON—Gathering resistance in the township's business community should surface for the first time when the proposed consumer agency ordinance is put before the public for discussion April 2.

Despite complaints from Chamber of Commerce president Bart Berg, the township board voted to hold a public hearing on the controversial ordinance next Wednesday beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the township fire hall.

Berg arrived after the unanimous vote, and when asked by Supervisor Robert Greenstein if he thought the

public hearing date was fair, responded, "You do as you see fit, as I am sure you will, but I question whether this leaves us sufficient time to contact all the businessmen interested in attending."

Clerk John Flodin replied, "This is only the first of several public hearings on this I am sure. We won't take any action Wednesday. I am sure it will be a while before the ordinance is acted on and probably not before substantial changes have been made."

Berg asked to see a copy of the township attorney's opinion and Greenstein responded, "We haven't re-

## Post office seeks new site

PLYMOUTH—Construction of a new post office in downtown Plymouth could get under way sometime in 1976.

That was the word from Plymouth Postmaster J. Arthur Mulligan, as he announced the United States Postal Service is looking for a site for a new facility in downtown Plymouth.

Mulligan said the proposed facility would be more than twice the size of the current building on Penniman Avenue. The Postal Service is looking for a site approximately 132,000 square feet, more than four times the size of the current site.

The added space will provide for parking for both postal customers and employees, something that is lacking at the present.

When asked if the postal service was considering taking bids for property to expand the current post office Mulligan said the possibility has not been ruled out, but added, "I don't think we're looking to add to this site. All the talk has been toward a completely new one."

Mulligan added that no discussion has been made about locating anywhere other than in the Plymouth downtown section. "The only site we're talking about is downtown Plymouth."

Bids on preferred sites of approximately 340 feet by 400 feet will be taken through April 25 at 4 p.m. Bids will be taken by mail addressed to

Charels W. Maxson, in care of the postmaster, 860 Penniman.

Bids can also be hand delivered to Maxson on April 25, between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. at the post office.

"I'm always glad to see continued growth in the post office," Mulligan said. "When you get trapped in a small building like we have now, you get problems coming at you from all sides."

"With the new building we will be able to provide improved services to the community and we will be able to provide for the continued growth within the Plymouth and Canton areas."

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# She's taken on the utility giants

Patricia Stefanski is a Livonia housewife quivering with such indignation that she is ready to take on such utility giants as the Consumers Power Co. and Detroit Edison.

The weapon chosen for her fight is the telephone, and because she is really angry, she has called "people I never dreamed of calling."

"I have talked to radio and newspaper reporters," she said. "I have spoken on those telephone talk shows on the radio. I have called U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch's office, Consumers Power Co., Detroit Edison, Michigan Public Service Commission, plus many friends."

"I'm calling everyone."

WHAT IS it that has yanked Mrs. Stefanski from a life of quiet domesticity into an instant course on home economics, a folder full of clippings and a head full of figures?

The rising cost of utilities, in general, and the fuel adjustment charge in particular.

"I've never been so upset about a thing," she said. "I think a lot about the little old ladies on social security who have to sit in 60-degree temperatures in winter because they can't afford a high utility bill. I hear them crying a lot on radio talk shows."

She points to rate increases won by Consumers Power in May and November and another that she says is due in the fall.

"Edison has had three raises in 13 months," she declared, her hand full of bill stubs. "And the government tells us to tighten our belts."

"We're paying for their fuel adjustments and mistakes at atomic energy plants, and they keep asking for more money constantly."

"It's got to be poor management to need all those raises."

SHE REFERRED to a letter recently sent to customers by Consumer Power, which asked, "Upset about your electric and gas bills?" It was sent to their 1.2 million electric customers and 930,000 gas customers.

But before the letter was sent the power company won authorization from the Michigan Public Service Commission to raise rates an average 64 cents a month.

"The letter didn't mention the new raise," said Mrs. Stefanski, who added that she had read the raise was designed to increase per share earnings rather than to compensate the company for higher fuel costs.

"One public service commissioner, William R. Ralls, said the timing of Consumers' letter was poor because fuel costs were not connected with the increase," said Mrs. Stefanski.

"I take my hat off to him," she

added. "But I'm afraid that on the commission, he is usually outvoted by the other two commissioners. Commissioner William Rosenberg usually votes with the utilities. A member of the law firm he worked for is on the board of directors of Detroit Edison."

"I think we should write Gov. William Milliken and ask for Rosenberg's resignation."

Mrs. Stefanski stresses that these commissioners who decide on rate increases are not elected, but appointed by the governor.

"IF PEOPLE don't start complaining to them, we are going to be faced with bigger bills."

When Mrs. Stefanski first became aroused over the rising costs of utilities, she contacted the Public Service Commission (PSC) by dialing a toll free number, 1-800-292-9555.

Everyone who has complaints should do this, she stated.

"The people who answer are good about giving information," she said. "However, you can't get in touch with the commissioners. No how. I call them the untouchables."

"To reach them you have to send a registered letter."

"When I called in January, I talked to a young lady who told me there was to be an open hearing in Lansing Jan. 28 about a new raise for the gas company."

"But how do people like us go to something like that. That's my gripe. It's not like you can run next door."

"Do they publicize these meetings? I couldn't find it in the newspaper. I called a radio talk show and asked them to invite the commissioners to go on the radio and answer questions from the public."

"The PSC had a representative talk on the radio the night before the hearing."

But general utility prices are not the only things that gall Mrs. Stefanski. She is also mad about a fuel adjustment charge that has turned up on her bills.

THE ADJUSTMENT charge was passed by the State legislature in December, 1972, according to Wendell Mason, assistant manager of the western Wayne division of Consumers Power Co. which includes Livonia, Westland, Plymouth, Novi, Wayne and Farmington.

The company placed the charge on the bills of residential customers in October, 1973. Edison applied it to its bills on March, 1974.

Its purpose is to allow the utility companies to ask a further charge from their consumers to compensate for rising fuel costs.

On Mrs. Stefanski's March bill from Edison this fuel adjustment charge was listed at \$3.34, which she explains

is almost 15 per cent of her total bill. While she finds this charge an additional irritation, it is not nearly as upsetting to her as the same charge as it appeared on her Consumers Power bill.

"For the first time, I noted on my March gas bill a fuel adjustment charge of \$.04520," she said. "When I called for an explanation they said it was a fuel cost factor, and that I should multiply the number by the number of units I used."

"That really got me. Most consumers are not even aware of what it means in the bill. I think Consumers Power should state the amount in dollars and cents, so we know exactly what is going on. For me, this amounted to 22 per cent of my total bill."

"This extra charge has been on our gas bills since November, 1973, but it was not visible until this March. Then they wrote it \$.04520, so I can't understand it."

"From what I've heard, the sky is the limit on this fuel adjustment charge."

CONSUMERS POWER and Edison have many answers to questions raised by consumers such as Mrs. Stefanski.

A call to the service information department of Consumers Power confirmed the fact that the customer is to multiply the amount at the bottom of his gas bill by the number of units used.

She said the company used this method of computing the charge because a telephone poll of customers indicated a preference for it.

She said the company did not anticipate changing the method. She said the amount had been included in previous bills without visible explanation.

except for about two times when it was written in.

In an interview, Mason recalled no such survey. He said he anticipated the fuel adjustment charge would appear on the bill in easily understood dollars and cents amounts sometime in the fall.

As to why it had been not placed on the bill earlier, he said, "We have problems with what we can put on a bill," adding that a large sized bill is more costly.

"It may not have been shown every month, when we included a message from the company in that space instead," he said. "However, a majority of our bills — or 90 per cent — were sent out with the charge listed on the bottom."

A CHECK with six local residents indicated that their gas bills were inconsistent as far as listing the fuel adjustment charge. But none had it stated more than twice.

Four said the charge appeared first on their March, 1975 bill. The other two said that in a year's supply of bills, it had turned up only twice.

"The purpose of the charge is to reduce the number of requests for rate increases due solely to the cost of fuel," Mason said, adding that there was no ceiling placed on this charge.

Mason explained that Consumers Power must go before the PSC to ask for general raises, but the fuel adjustment charge is an automatic increase when the cost of gas goes up.

The commission periodically reviews these costs and the companies must justify their charges in terms of what they have to pay in higher fuel costs.

"The commission knows exactly what we're doing on this," he said.

# Police protection is responsibility of townships

The day of reckoning has finally arrived for Plymouth and Canton Townships, and the two boards will have to make decisions quickly or be without effective police protection.

It all came about when Circuit Court Judge Thomas Foley, a resident of Plymouth Township, handed down an opinion after dismissing a suit brought by seven townships against the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and Sheriff William Lucas complaining that the present road patrol protection wasn't adequate and needed augmenting by additional deputy sheriffs.

Judge Foley's opinion told the seven townships that if they wanted police protection, they would have to pay for it. No question about the road patrol adding deputies, no question about whether the Board of Commissioners was required to finance such a patrol... he opined that the townships had to pay, or no police protection.

He didn't make any bones about the fact that nowhere in the law is there anything that says the commissioners should pay for a road patrol, and nowhere is there a statute which says the sheriff has to patrol anywhere. He must answer calls and he must provide protection for special events and that's all.

WE EXPECT the townships will appeal the dismissal, but from this point of view, it appears as if they'll be sending more good money after bad. In other words, it appears, from Judge Foley's

opinion, there isn't anything to appeal.

Judge Foley is known as one who studies every single facet of a case before making a decision. His opinion this time shows he spent quite a few hours in research as a judge should, and believes he has made the only decision possible within the facts available.

And that means both townships will have start making plans for their own protection. It means residents will have to approve additional millage to handle the funding or else find themselves without effective police protection.

That is, unless one figures an occasional appearance of a sheriff's car is enough. We don't think so. We never did believe the police protection in Plymouth Township was adequate and don't think so right now.

BUT THAT'S beside the point. There have been complaints for several years about the protection in Plymouth Township. No such complaints came in Canton Township since it was more or less a rural community then, not the bustling community of today.

But always the township supervisor managed to stall off any action but putting together reports which showed there was little crime in the township and it was being taken care of by both the road patrol and the Michigan State Police.

One should remember during the days of the Roy Lindsay and John McEwen reigns, a captain of the State Police resided in the community and did a little extra to provide better protection than a township ordinarily would get.

That shouldn't be taken to mean the State Police don't patrol now. They do. But we'll always believe that particular captain did watch over his home community like a guardian angel.

THAT'S ALL PAST tense now. Once again the township boards have been told to finance the police or forget about protection. In recent years, it has been the Wayne County Board of Commissioners threatening to stop financing the road patrol.

Under Judge Foley's opinion the commissioners don't have to threaten to cut back; they don't have to sanction the road patrol.

Both township supervisors J.D. McLaren of Plymouth and Robert Greenstein of Canton have the task of telling their people the time has arrived to pay for these services.

It's long past the time when the townships try to furnish the same services as one gets in the cities and still wiggle out of paying.

Residents in new communities have to be aware of the fact that services are costly and it's their responsibility to pay for them. Sure, it's a hard way to go with business conditions as they are, but these are the facts of life and folks in the two communities will have to realize it.

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## Blaming others proves nothing

It's a classic battle that occurs throughout the nation: When jurisdiction is shared, who picks up the tab?

Two local battles currently loom with that theme. Who will pay for the lighting on the Joy-I-275 overpass, and who will take the responsibility for the access road to the Windsor Park School site?

Curiously enough, we can find Canton Township officials arguing either side of the question, as they try to place responsibility for the bridge lights, "equally" on Plymouth township, and then turn around and state that the school district must foot the full burden of the access road.

THE FINANCIAL concerns are paramount in both issues, with Clerk John Floding commenting in the case of the bridge lights, "They (Plymouth Township) feel that since we have five mills and they only have one, they shouldn't have to pay."

The same argument may be put to Canton on the access road: Since the school district has 34 mills and Canton only has five, Canton shouldn't have to pay. That appears to be the position Supervisor Robert Greenstein has taken with regard to school district funds.

The real issue is placed on who will benefit from both the bridge lights and the access road. In both cases, it is Canton residents, and in both cases Canton is trying to squirm out of a situation and place the blame on the other guy.

POOR PLANNING on the part of Canton left a school site in the midst of a subdivision, with nothing other than a residential access. Canton is now "absolved" of any blame because it is either "the fault of the previous board," "the responsibility of the county" or perhaps the "responsibility of the school district (with the access road)" or the federal government (with the bridge lights).

There may be some merit in any of the blame placing on the part of Canton officials, and we realize that they do not have all the power necessary to make some of the necessary corrections. Roads in Canton are the responsibility of the county, and the bridge was built by the state and federal governments.

BUT RATHER than continually placing the blame on someone else we would prefer to see Canton officials take a positive step toward some mutual problem solving, maybe even a concession or compromise, rather than paying lip service to a stated intention towards cooperation.

It would almost appear that cooperation with Canton means having things go the way Canton and its supervisor want them to go.

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## Paulina brings her own joy from Colombia

A tiny girl in a blue pantsuit and red and white shoes bounced to the door when this reporter arrived at the Livonia home of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Clayton.

She held up her arms to be lifted, and announced quickly that her name was Paulina Joy Clayton. She fingered a necklace, said it was pretty, and identified the dark stone as "black, no, green."

She kept up such rapid-fire conversation and was so completely at home it was hard to realize this little one had been in the United States only since December.

It was just four days before Christmas that the Peace Corps worker who had traveled with her from her native Colombia turned her over to the Claytons, her new parents, in Chicago.

"PAULINA WAS HER NAME when she came to the orphanage in Colombia nearly four years ago," Marilyn Clayton said. "We added Joy as a middle name because we were so glad to have her. And it has turned

out just right—she really is a joy."

The Claytons consider their bright little adopted daughter "pretty special" in her adaptability and progress in learning, and they also have a very special spot in their hearts for Colombian-American Friends, Inc., (CAF), the agency that played the major role in bringing her to them.

They spotted her picture among several that the agency, a liaison service for inter-county adoption had on hand during a meeting in its Ann Arbor headquarters, and consider themselves extremely lucky that eight months later they were able to bring her home as their daughter.

BUT THE STORY of how the Claytons and Paulina became a family goes back to long before the meeting. After several years of marriage, Mrs. Clayton said, this couple were convinced they would not have children and decided to adopt. But that wasn't easy, they found.

"We applied to several agencies in Michigan and got nowhere," she said. "We tried the Holt agency in Oregon,

known for its handling of difficult adoptions. They are flooded with requests—they said it would be a long wait."

And the Claytons, both 31, felt they just didn't want to wait a long time to bring a child into their home.

IT WAS THEN that they read a small newspaper article about CAF and headed for the meeting where they "saw a picture of Paulina and fell in love with her."

Although realizing there was no certainty that the child in the picture was still available for adoption, they put in motion the process necessary to become adoptive parents.

"We had to have a pre-adoption home study made," Clayton said,

"and when we applied to the Wayne County office of the Michigan Department of Social Services we were told it wouldn't be possible in the near future."

"So we went to Lutheran Children's Friends and we were lucky. They were able to get it completed quickly so that we could get Paulina just eight months from the time we first knew about her."

ADOPTION PROCEEDINGS are worrisome at best, and the Claytons have been especially grateful to the Colombian-American Friend for the supportive help during the waiting time.

"They were always right there, a telephone call away, when we wanted to know how things were going," Mrs. Clayton said.

"We've also appreciated the help they have given since Paulina has been with us. We can call about anything, and they are ready to answer questions or give advice."

The Claytons also expressed thanks to Michigan Rep. John Markes (D-Westland), who has sponsored, with Rep. Melvin R. Larsen (R-Oxford) a bill to require state agencies to continue pre-adoption studies for citizens adopting foreign-born children.

After an announcement some

months ago that such studies would be discontinued, the Claytons took part in a Lansing rally that led to a stay of that action until July 1 of this year.

"We understand the problem that they do not have the personnel to do this," Marilyn Clayton said, "but there is no other way the children can be adopted, and there are no young children available here."

SINCE PAULINA'S arrival, the Claytons have had more reason than ever to be thankful to agencies like Colombian-American Friends.

"We would like to see many American families work through CAF," Mrs. Clayton said. "We know there are many more small children, though hardly any babies, in Colombian orphanages, and we've been most impressed with what we have learned about these institutions."

"They must give the children extremely good care—Paulina is in excellent health and learns so fast and has such good personal care habits. She's had a lot of love before coming to us."

She also mentioned that there have been follow-up letters from the orphanage through the CAF about her progress here. "They really care," she concluded.

Families interested in the CAF can call the Claytons, 14193 Park, or write to the agency, P.O. Box 72, Ann Arbor, Mich. 48107.

THE CLAYTONS have had a get-together with other families in the metropolitan area who have adopted through CAF, and they plan to keep up this contact.

"We want to have the children grow up knowing others of the same heritage," Clayton said, "and we want to know more about that culture too."

Another purpose of continued meetings would be projects to raise funds to help the South American orphanages, with clothing and medical supplies, for example.

Paulina has picked up English and American ways amazingly fast, her parents think. She's the darling of the nearby McDonald's restaurant, and she's beginning to know a few children in her neighborhood.

In fact, Mrs. Clayton said, about the only time she seems shy is when someone speaks Spanish to her. "I think she wants to be entirely American," her new mother said.

That was borne out as the photographer put away his camera and waved. "Adios, Paulina," he said.

"No, no," answered the little girl, shaking her head. "Bye-bye."

## On U-MD campus

### Betty considers herself an ombudsperson

The new coordinator of women's programs at the Dearborn campus of the University of Michigan sees herself as an ombudsperson.

"Lots of women find it difficult to cope with a rather large institution," said Betty Kaufman. "So I try to go to bat for them with teachers and administration. If I don't have answers for them I can find out who does."

But Mrs. Kaufman regards advocacy as only part of her work. She will offer counseling, both group and individual, for the continuing women, those whose education has been interrupted.

She will also bring to the Dearborn campus programs of interest not only to campus women, but to women of the surrounding communities. Such programs will include both speakers and films.

"DEVELOPING SKILLS in Programming for Women" is the title of

a two-day program May 4 and 5 in the Dearborn Inn.

With Martha Griffiths as keynote, the seminar is designed for women's groups, churches, Y organizations, social agencies and educational institutions, who want to initiate women's programs.

It will introduce them to budgeting, fundraising, promotion and other practical problems.

With a master's degree in social work, Mrs. Kaufman has not always devoted her professional interests to women's issues. She has worked with persons of every age and sex.

At the U-M medical center, she worked with chronically and acutely ill geriatric and obese patients. In Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti school districts she served as a social worker.

She was also employed by the Tuskegee Institute community education program as social work director.

MRS. KAUFMAN is excited to be professionally involved with the

women at this time, although she has worked as a volunteer for the Ann Arbor area National Organization for Women and is a member of the executive board.

"We're coming into an historical era when women are going to move forward. Now with good public health and birth control, it is clear women's biological role won't last a lifetime."

"It's in the air — growth and self-realization for women, particularly as their children get into school and they have more free time."

"This has always been true, but now from a trickle it has become a river."

IF THESE WOMEN need help when they decide upon an academic career at U-M Dearborn, Mrs. Kaufman stands ready to offer counseling or just plain on-going support.

"If a woman feels the need of education or career counseling, she might come to me," noted Mrs. Kaufman. "We can also talk about all sorts of practical problems such as how to get her kids looked after, or how to deal with a husband who may not fall in with her ideas."

"Women are at all levels of consciousness and self-assertion. Like any good therapist, I take people where they are and where they want to go."

"Certainly not all want to become radical feminists, but most want equal pay for equal work, and an opportunity to develop their potential."

Mrs. Kaufman finds women are changing very rapidly. "The housewife who might come into my life one year is very different the next year."

"It's not because of me. It's just that once you have started a process of growth there is no telling where it could end."

"That is what's so fascinating."

Proceeds from the sale will be used by this organization in its support of its world-wide trade schools, which teach a trade to needy persons.

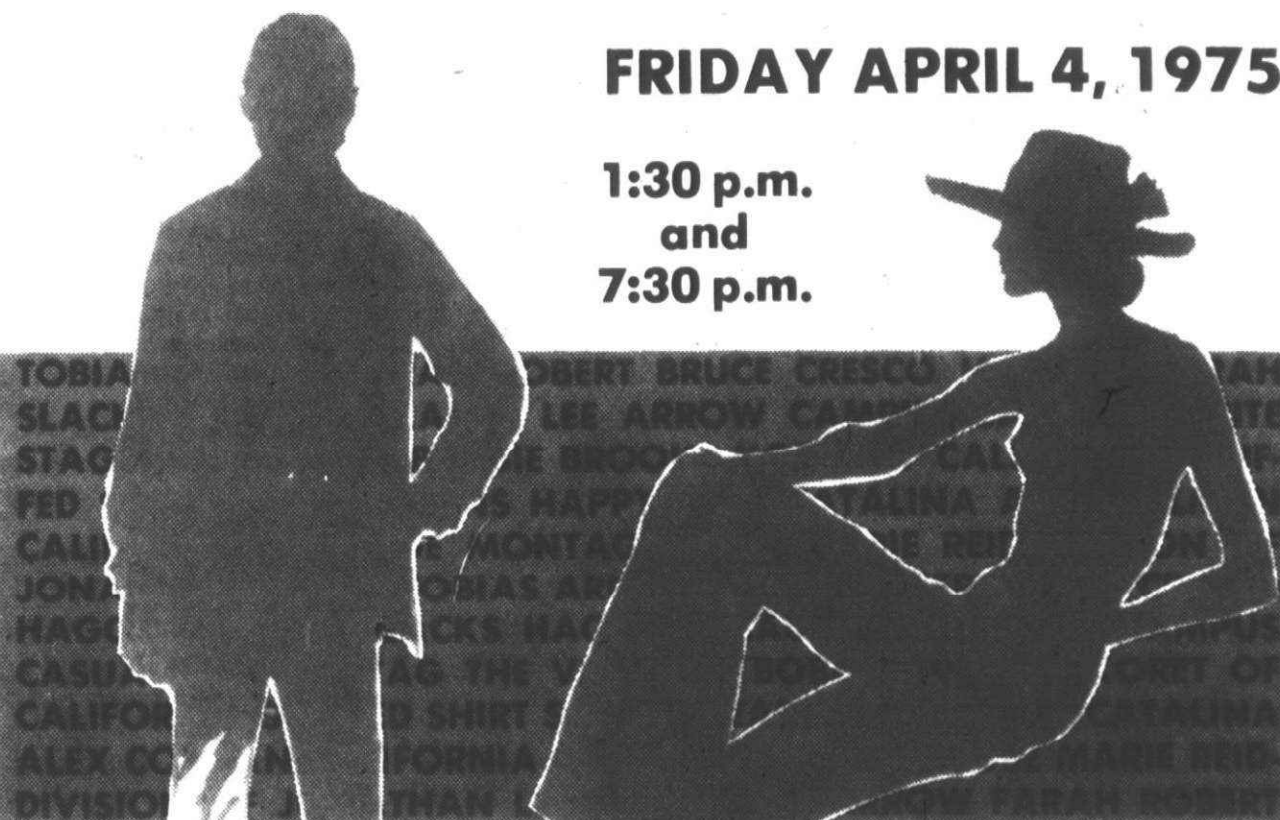

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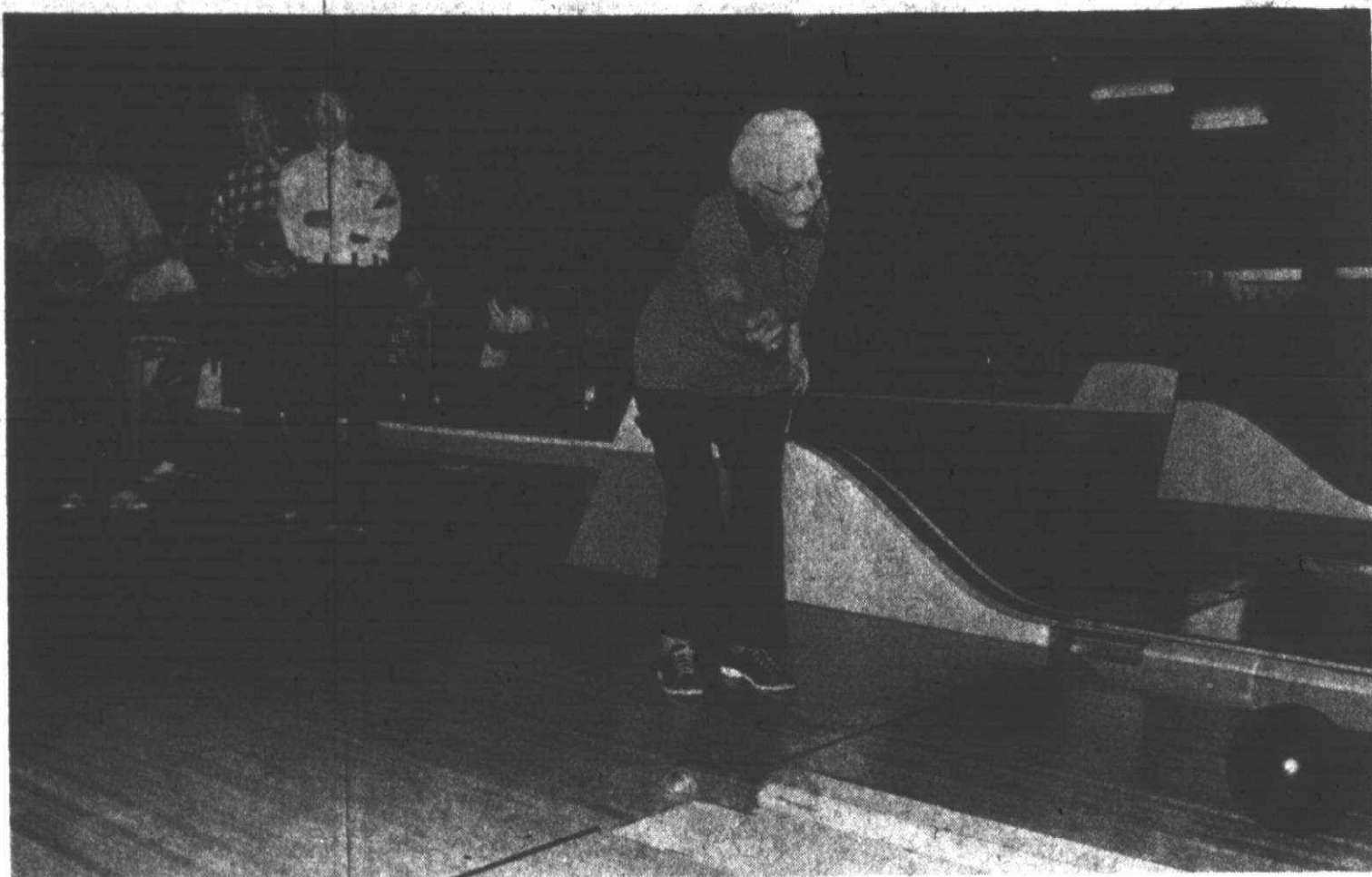

## 'You're never too old to bowl' a senior pin league proves

They may not be as spry as they used to be. Their legs don't take them up to the foul line with a long stride and their eyes may not be as sharp as they once were. But when it comes to real enthusiasm, the group of octogenarians in the senior citizens league at Livonia Lanes sets a great example for the younger generation of bowlers.

Leading the group is white haired Thelma Nedel, who admits to 86 years and is proud of it. She makes the trip from her home in Farmington to be with the group that provides so much enjoyment.

With her each Thursday afternoon are Albert Hackey, now 88; Robert Cadieux, who is 82, and Howard Wendt, who proudly boasts of being 81 and still being able to carry a 141 average.

The league, pioneer of all senior citizen leagues in the metropolitan area, was organized by Clarence Hoffman, former owner of the lanes, a quarter of a century ago.

Since then it hasn't missed a week during the bowling season and boasts 15 mem-

bers who were born prior to the turn of the century.

Mrs. Nedel, now the "darling" of the league, has been bowling since 1938 and graciously recalls that she began in the old Detroit Recreation Building, that was razed several years ago.

"I used to go there to watch my husband bowl," she said, "with a league from the Detroit News where he was an engraver. Finally, I tired of being a spectator, tried it myself and I've been bowling ever since."

"I am so fortunate," she said, "to have had my health all these years and I still drive my own automobile. And I am so fortunate to be with a league like this—it helps to keep me feeling young."

The most unusual member of the league, though, is Albert Hackey.

Now 88 years old, he didn't start bowling until he passed his 80th birthday. Smilingly, he says that he was attracted to the game while watching others having so much fun while trying to knock over the pins.

"Not many people would start something new when they reach my age," he said, "but I like the game so much, and

get so much enjoyment I bowl in two leagues each week.

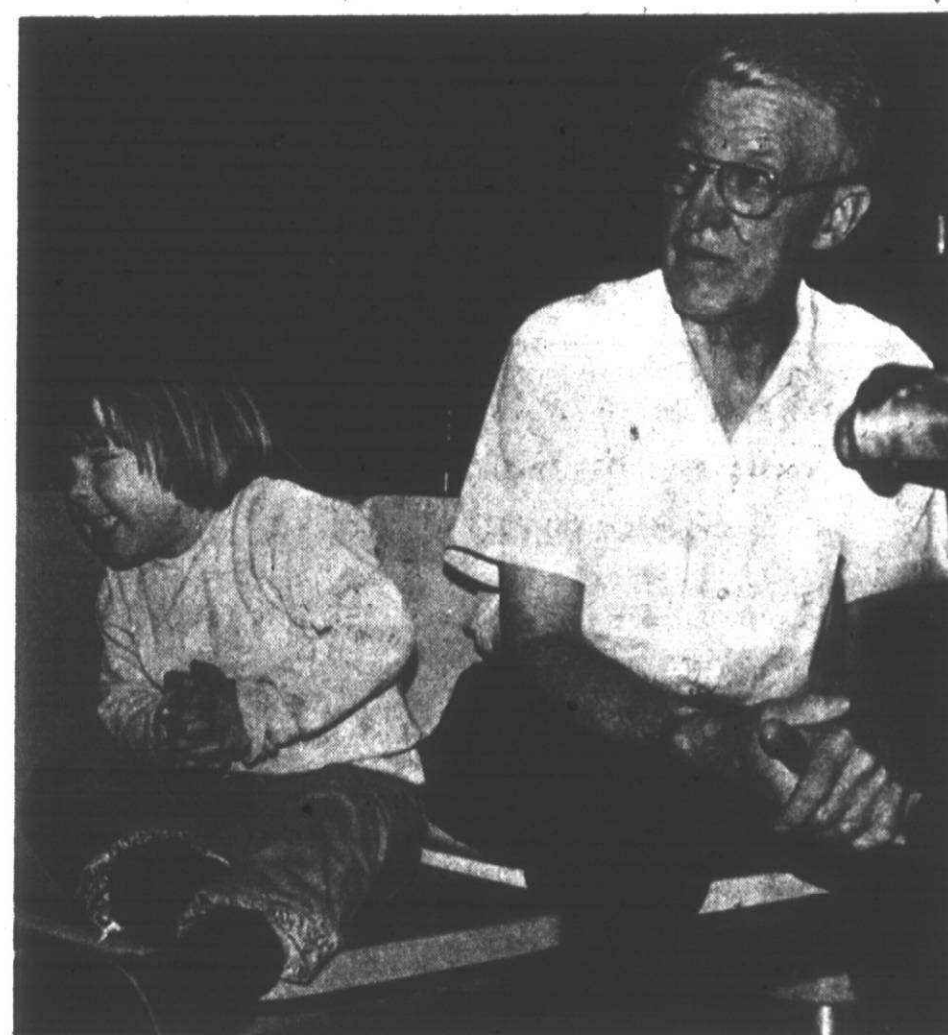
The league, one of the largest in the area, with 16 teams (80 bowlers) takes over the entire Livonia establishment each Thursday. And many fond memories are recalled as they take their turn on the approaches.

There's Ed Burke who has been bowling for 70 years, and started when he was only 14 years old on the Detroit east side. For years he bowled in the old East-West Traveling League that was a fixture on Saturday nights.

With him is Jerry Ryan who has been bowling since 1917 at the old duplex alleys at Fort Street and Clark Avenue in Detroit. He is a member of the alumni of Bert Allen's famed establishment on Michigan Avenue that boasted "two alleys without a pillar or post and no elevators."

Another of the old timers still having a lot of fun is Ed Gurney, who showed he has lost none of his skill by posting a 626 series last week.

But the "queen" of them all is Thelma Nedel, the white haired lady from Farmington, who sets the example for the entire league.



## Glenn, Pats bid for NWS track title

It will be a two team race this year for Northwest Suburban League track honors, but there's no telling which of the two talent-laden squads, John Glenn or Livonia Franklin, will eventually walk away with the title.

Don't ask the coaches of the two teams for advice on the matter, though. Each considers the other team the one to beat.

With an unusually high number of sprinters around the 10 second mark

in the 100 yard dash, plus a plethora of individual stars in other events, there'll be plenty of action when the league meet comes around on May 21.

Here's a rundown of each area team in the league:

**LIVONIA FRANKLIN** — Patriot coach Bob Holmes admits that he "has some spots where we'll be strong" but said his lack of depth in the field events may hurt his team's chances to take the league title from John Glenn.

"In some of the field events we have a first man and then a fourth man. I think Glenn is the team to beat," he said.

But the Franklin team is plenty strong in other areas and particularly in the speed events.

In standout senior Dan Quinn, Franklin has the returning 100 yard dash league champion. Quinn and his exceptionally fast teammates should combine to give the Patriots the fastest relay teams in the area.

Junior halfmiler Chuck Ronan placed second in the Northwest Suburban last year and looks to move up to the top spot. Distance man John Fritz ran the two-mile in 9:40 last year and should improve.

Franklin's biggest loss came not through graduation but when top hurdler Dale Lee moved to Alpena.

"His loss hurt us but we should be a good challenge for Glenn. We'll be good enough," said Holmes.

**JOHN GLENN** — Glenn shares the favorite's role with Livonia Franklin but Rocket coach Barry Basel is far from overconfident.

"Right now I would say that Franklin is the team to beat," he said.

But Basel has a few trackmen of his own and the defending champion Rockets are well deserving of their co-favorite rating. A pair of junior sprinters, Terry Bixler and Fred Shoemaker, displayed 10.2 and 10.1 speed in the 100 yard dash last year and should challenge Franklin's depth in the sprints.

Tom Jacobowski might be the best hurdler in the area and middle distance men Tom Harris and Dave Johnson aren't about to let anyone run away from them.

The distance races will be run by Toby Theodore who was clocked in 10:06 for two miles last year and Mike Laing, a real question mark who shows promise but sat out all last year with injuries.

Mike Alimpich, a senior who went 6:2 in the high jump last year, leads the field event crew and a large group

of sophomores, paced by Ted Unold, should provide depth.

**THURSTON** — Coach Ray Williams calls this a "rebuilding year" at Thurston where he lost several standouts including All-Area standout quarter miler Rick Westphal from last year's squad via graduation.

Despite the depletion of the ranks, Williams has a crew of several outstanding individuals, but lacks the depth to be considered a factor in the league race.

Probably the best of the lot is defending league champion high jumper Darryl Korzyan. Junior distance man Craig Reynolds also is a standout and sprinter Matt Whitehead, with a 10.1 time in the hundred to his credit, can fly with the best.

The Eagles will count on Bob Zichichi to lead in the field events as the shot putter should go around 48 feet this spring.

"Actually, we have one good performer in just about every event," Williams said. "It's just that we don't have the depth to back the number one man up."

**GARDEN CITY EAST**— First year Panther coach Brian Murphy is confronted with a rebuilding program of the first order and he readily admits that his priority is to attain respectability this season rather than challenge for the league title.

The East program was cut short last year and Murphy has had to deal with what he termed school apathy and a squad lacking the basic numbers to be successful.

"I only have 19 people out for track. My goal is to be representative and to start building a program. I'm an optimist," he said.

One of the few reasons Murphy has for optimism can be seen in his distance running team of seniors Art Kitz and Doug Sweazey.

The two are among only five returning lettermen, but should score some points for East. Kitz ran a 4:28 mile indoors recently and Sweazey has been clocked at 9:49 for the two mile.

In junior Brian Domini, Murphy has "potentially a very good half-miler" and Murphy said that senior Dennis Volz, who runs the same distance, "has all the tools."

The field events will be manned by Steve Anderson, who put the shot 46 feet last year, senior pole vaulter Brian Howard who has cleared 12 feet and sophomore high jumper Shelby Perkins who jumped 5-9 as a ninth grader.

## Rocks, RU challenge in Sub Eight track

Dearborn High and Edsel Ford have been the traditional powers in Suburban Eight League track and this year should prove no different.

But area teams such as Plymouth Salem and Redford Union should have individuals that challenge for league championships, and either could be considered an outside threat for team honors if the proper breaks come.

Here's a rundown on the two Suburban Eight teams:

**REDFORD UNION** — Coach John MacKenzie is being a little more careful about his optimism this year than he was last season.

"I think we've got the makings of a pretty good team, but I said that last year and we were plagued with injuries. This year I have my fingers crossed and I want to be careful about making any predictions," he said.

Barring any medical mishaps, though, RU should have some good individuals and in the field events in particular is where the Panthers should shine.

Senior shotputter Bradley Ross had a 52-foot toss to his credit last year and is back stronger than ever. Pole vaulter Jeff Kunnert has nowhere to go but up after clearing 12-6 as a junior and the high jump will be taken care of by Jack Helzer who has a 6-2 liftoff to his credit.

The injury bug has already hit in other areas, however, with star quarter miler Jack LaLonde sidelined with what is believed to be mononucleosis. LaLonde was one of the area's top preps at his distance as a sophomore and his absence will be felt.

MacKenzie said the sprints and the distances are the biggest question marks but he has not been able to get a true line on any of his performers yet.

"It's difficult to say this early in the year. So far our track has been under water," he said.

**PLYMOUTH SALEM** — First year

Salem coach Gary Balconi says that it's too early to tell how good his team will be but there's one thing for sure — enthusiasm in the program, as witnessed by a turnout of 60 potential trackmen, is at an all time high.

"To an extent, I have to attribute that enthusiasm to the kind of year Salem is having overall," said Balconi in reference to the Rock football and basketball teams, both of which were true state powers.

Whatever the reason for the turnout, Balconi is far from displeased. With a variety of good athletes and a practice schedule which began last December, Salem could surprise in the Sub 8.

Capt. Mark DeMerit is an example of why the Rocks might have a fine season. The senior quarter miler was timed at 50.5 last year and is expected to break 49 seconds this year. Bob Evans is rounding into shape after going to the state semifinals with the Rock basketball team and is expected to be a stalwart at the half mile, while senior Ted Burton will be trying to break the 50 foot barrier in the shot put.

If sophomore Walt White can pick up where he left off as a ninth grader, Salem will be set in the distance events. White was clocked in 4:40 for the mile last season, second fastest in the state for his age.

Kim Woody is on the injured list right now but the senior pole vaulter is capable of clearing 14 feet. Senior Doug Ward will pace the sprinters, while freshmen Greg Davis and Chris Ritchie will help out.

Bob Spisich cleared 6-1 in the high jump and 20 feet in the long jump last year and will continue at those events. Freshman Scott Kleam shows promise in the distance events.

"I guess we're too young to make a serious challenge," Balconi said. "But when the league meet roles around on May 28, we may surprise some people."

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## Plymouth Junior C icers finish 2nd

When is second best still the best? When it's the Plymouth Junior C hockey team. Although the Plymouth pucksters came up one game shy in their bid for the divisional state championship last week, the mere fact that they advanced to the finals of the event made them the most successful hockey team ever in the city.

THE PLYMOUTH TEAM, sponsored by V.C. Mooney Construction Company, fell to Trenton in the state championship match 5-2 last week at Oak Park Arena.

After finishing the regular season with an unspectacular 35-19-6 record, Plymouth advanced to the state final tournament by outlasting a seven-team regional field and beating Redford 7-2, 5-2 in the two game, most goals, regional finals.

Then it was on to Oak Park and the eight-team regional championship tournament for the state title. The eight teams were divided into two four-team brackets and were scheduled to play each team in their bracket.

The Plymouthites started out right, bouncing Lakeland and Oak Park by identical 7-5 scores. Russ Baltazar scored four goals versus Lakeland and Tom Hawkins tallied an equal number of times against Oak Park.

Plymouth then lost to Detroit in its final divisional game but its runner-up status was sufficient to get the team into the championship round.

In the semi-final game of the tournament, Plymouth captain Bill Prochazka scored with just 31 seconds remaining in the final period to lift Plymouth past Warren 4-3. In all, four different players tallied for Plymouth as the team rallied from a 2-0 deficit after one period to gain a berth in the state finals versus Trenton.

IN THAT CHAMPIONSHIP game, Plymouth fell behind quickly again, 3-0 after one period. Plymouth narrowed the gap to 3-1 after two periods but Trenton, a team which had beaten Plymouth twice during the regular season, scored two goals in the first four minutes and 11 seconds of the final period to put the game away.

Plymouth coach Mike Myers offered no excuses for his team's loss in the finals.

"Trenton is a great team," he said. "Their first line is just tremendous."

The Plymouth team was hampered by injuries in that final game, however, as Prochazka played with a total of 12 stitches in various parts of his anatomy, a bruised shoulder and an injured foot and, in all, four of the six Plymouth forwards suffered from some sort of injury.

Myers, who is in his first year of coaching the Plymouth team, was assisted by team manager Bob Myrtle and alternate coach Bill Kane. Myers coached four years at Central Michigan University before coaching the Junior C team.

## West track tradition faces tough challenge

Without quite coming out and saying it, Garden City West track coach Bill Pinnell has admitted the Tiger dominance in the Tri-River League may be about over.

West has had the patent rights on the league championship for three years now but a loss of key people may move the Tigers back in the pack this year.

"We'll have a tough time defending

our league championship because we have lost some good people. But we have 12 lettermen back," Pinnell said.

One area where the Tigers should have no problem this year is in the pole vault. Pinnell has a trio of good vaulters back this year, led by senior Garth McGrath who cleared 13 feet last season.

Miller Mike Cundiff, only a junior, crossed the tape in 4:33 last year and placed fifth in the state regional. Two miler Scott Kennedy, half miler Al Gerrard and quarter miler Don Frank all should be standouts for West as should sprinters Dave Havener and Russ Dey.

But it is in the other areas where the Tigers will be hurting.

"We aren't real strong in either the sprint events or the hurdles," Pinnell said.

Pinnell said he expects Cherry Hill and Melvindale to vie for the Tri-River championship and gave Riverview an outside shot.

But if on nothing more than tradition, nobody is counting out Garden City West just yet.

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# Turf Tips, Quips

Inasmuch as controversy is still red hot over the failure of Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley to give summer dates to Northville Downs, we thought it might raise a point by comparing the Northville summer handle against that of this winter.

There isn't any question that summer racing is more lucrative than winter in this part of the land even though the commissioner has shown figures which have the 'Downs running far ahead of its statistics for last winter.

That's all true enough, Northville's current meeting got away fast and never lost the impetus. Even when the thoroughbreds started racing at the Detroit Race Course the wagering and attendance continued to soar. There were those who predicted a 15 to 20 per cent drop when the runners opened but such has not been the case.

A CHECK of the figures for the past two years shows Northville Downs is averaging \$363,000 nightly now, the best winter meeting ever. But last summer the half-mile plant averaged \$393,000 and that happens to be a difference of \$30,000 nightly.

With those figures in hand, then we fail to see how the commissioner can possibly argue successfully that winter racing has been a big boon for the track. A difference of \$30,000 per night hardly upholds that kind of thinking.

Perhaps the biggest boost Northville has received in a long time was the blaze that shut down Windsor for the remainder of the season and left the 'Downs with the only night game in the area.

Business has picked up considerably since the disastrous fire last weekend, proving that someone's hard luck generally works for the benefit of someone else.

JUST WHEN FOLKS were beginning to wonder when Bea and Charlie Farber were going to ship their stock from the west coast back home for

the start of the Hazel Park meeting...lo and behold the name of Easy Irv appears in the entry box at Northville Downs.

It was thought for a while the Farbers would keep him in competition at Los Alamitos, a track not far from Los Angeles, but apparently they decided it was about time to get back home.

Easy Irv made his first appearance in Michigan this year in Saturday's open pace at Northville Downs.

RACING SECRETARY Bill Connors is expected to check in at Hazel Park later this week to get ready for the opening night draw. Bill has been busy at the highly successful meeting at Pompano Park but had to leave with three weeks to go to take over at the east side oval. The 83-night meeting there opens on April 9.

Bob Braden, who has been the starter for the Jackson Raceway and Jackson-Northville meetings, will have that assignment at Hazel Park. He succeeds Chuck Coon who reportedly is back in New York state. At the moment there isn't any indicator as to whether Chuck will be back at Wolverine in mid-summer or stay with his present assignments.

Clay Hulett will take over as state steward and Frank Meharg will be one of the judging staff at Henderson, Ky. Meharg had served as state steward for the Jackson-Northville and Northville Downs meetings.

The two trade off meetings but wind up the year with almost identical nights in the judges stand.

WITH THE OPENING of the 90-day major meeting of the thoroughbreds at the Detroit Race Course, fans can expect better racing. That isn't to be taken to mean that racing was bad during March but it does signify that the track will have better horseflesh now.

Racing Director Tom Dorsey returned to the big mile track late last week and reported many stables from the highly successful meet at Oaklawn track in Hot Springs, Ark. will

be checking in within a few days.

Dorsey spent several days at the Arkansas oval talking with owners and trainers and came back with good news. Some of the top ranking horses will be here for the DRC season.

Vice president and general manager Dick Wilson Wednesday announced the second boost in purses. This time the biggest hike was in the featured events which climbed from \$7,500 to \$10,000. For all other classes it averaged about \$300 per race.

That's an indication the operation has been better than early predictions and could mean the DRC will see the bright side of the statistical story this year for the first time in three years.

Of course the season has barely begun but the impetus is there and tradition has proved that once a racing plant gets off on the right foot, it stays there and things get better for the entire campaign. It's about time the DRC received a financial break after suffering so long.

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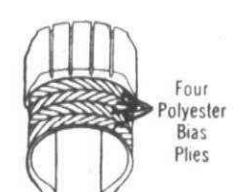
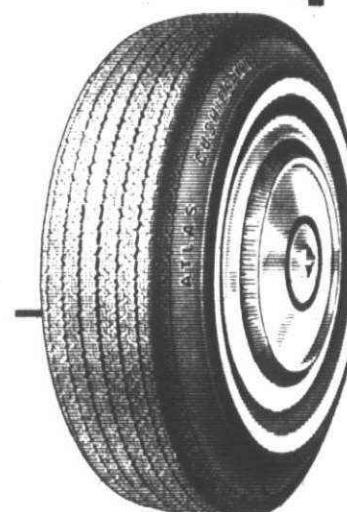
