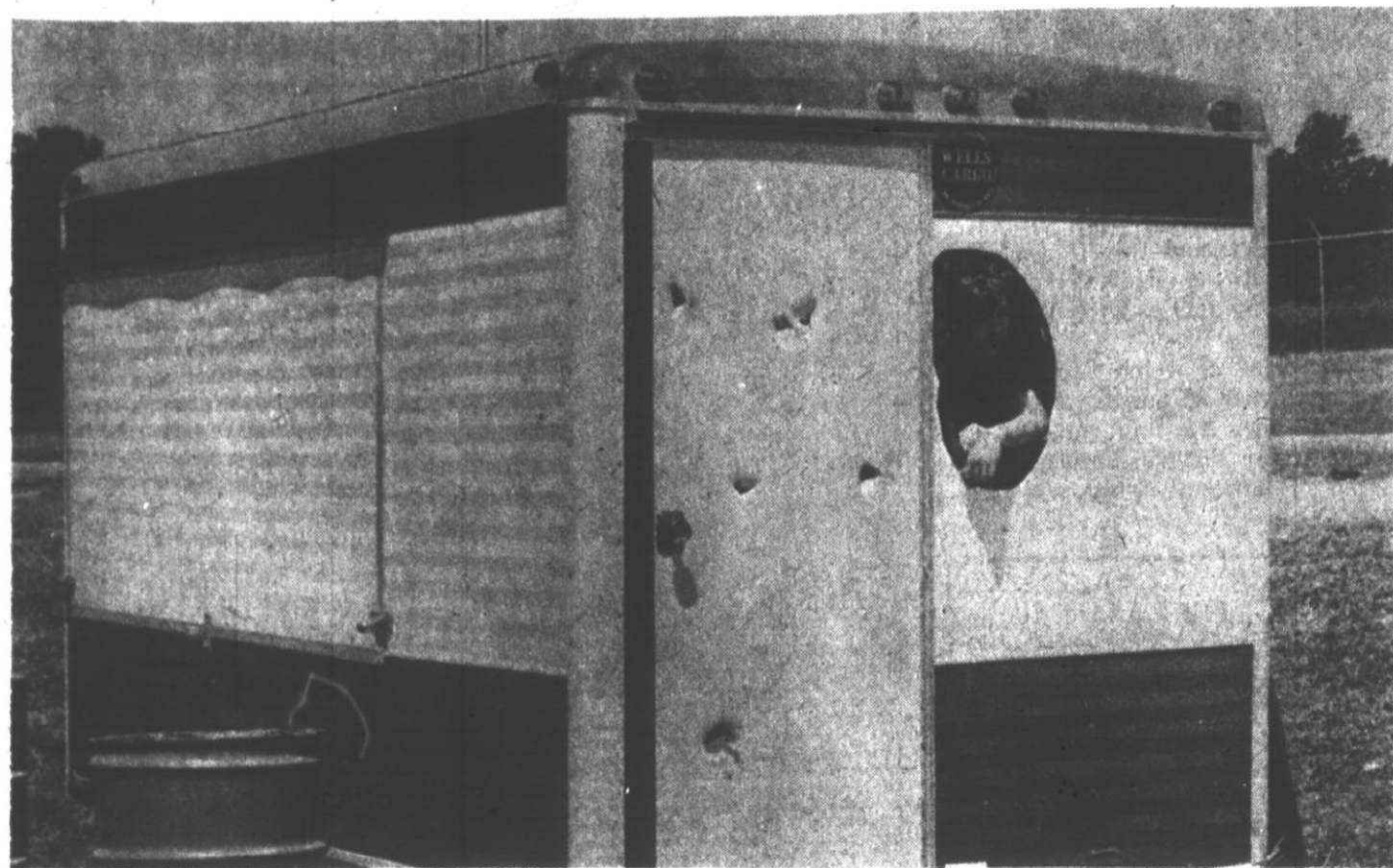

secretary-treasurer Jeanne Goodrich estimates the total damage at close to \$500. (Staff photo)

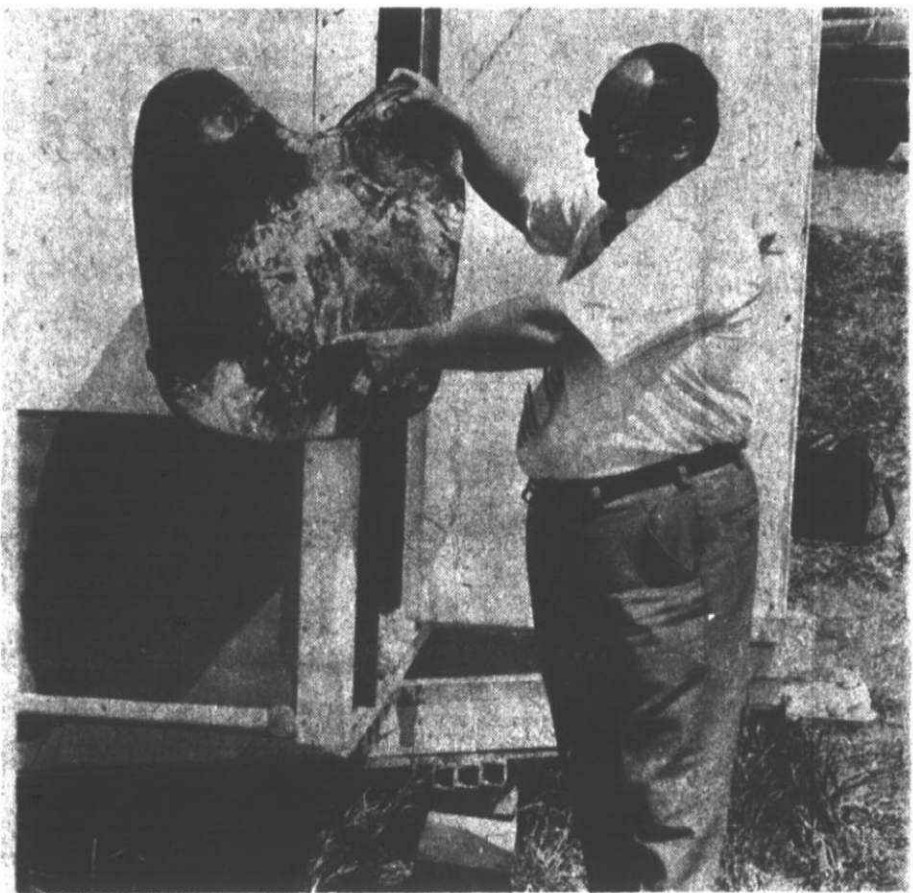
Vandals hit little league storage trailer

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—Armed with a pair of tinsnips and wearing some rather large boots, vandals broke into a storage trailer of the Plymouth Community Junior Baseball League over the weekend taking more than \$200 in equipment, candy and baseball cards.

According to the league's secretary-treasurer, Jeanne Goodrich, the intruders took several boxes of candy, two boxes of baseball cards, an umpire's face mask and chest protector, and five dozen baseballs.

Mrs. Goodrich speculated that the vandals made their entry sometime Sunday evening after a heavy rain. Large muddy footprints were left on the front of two chest protectors left lying on the floor when the vandals left.

PCJBL vice president Art Mulligan said damage to the trailer hit close to the \$300 mark. He said part of the damage would be covered by insurance, but the remainder of the loss would have to come from league funds.

Hit man is ordered to pay for jail keep

The Bloomfield Township gunman who shot down Plymouth insurance man Chuck Finlan and left him paralyzed may soon be paying his room and board at Jackson State Prison.

A court order by Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Harry J. Dingeman Jr. could take away a sizeable chunk of a \$50,000 inheritance of Donald Crenshaw, who was convicted of assault charges in 1972 as a result of the attempt on Finlan's life.

Finlan has been paralyzed from the waist down since the shooting in a downtown Plymouth parking lot in broad daylight on May 31, 1972.

CRENSHAW'S ATTORNEY, Peter Barbara, said he was drafting an appeal of Dingeman's ruling, charging that the 1934 state law which prompted the room and board bill was "unconstitutional."

The court ruling places the cost of

Crenshaw's keep at \$12.33 per day, or \$4,500 for each year in prison.

According to Crenshaw's court-appointed guardian, Ralph Goldsmith, the room and board fees could be made retroactive from Crenshaw's date of sentencing in November 1972. The convicted assailant is serving a term of six to 10 years on the charge, but would be eligible for parole within the next two years.

Barbara said this is only the first time he has heard of the 1934 law being used, but according to Goldsmith the state has used the law on several occasions during the past 40 years.

He noted a recent case in which Circuit Judge Thomas Foley signed an order for a man to pay \$4,000 of a \$6,000 inheritance just before his release from prison.

Foley said the case came before him within the last year.

Goldsmith added the law had been used in a case against Holt Photographic studios during the 1940s or '50s in which the owner of the studio was forced to pay \$7,000 to \$8,000 of a \$50,000 inheritance when it was learned he was paying money for the keep of his dog and his garden while in prison.

NOTING THE "change in thinking" about court decisions in recent years, Barbara said he was "confident that the court will see the ruling as a violation of Crenshaw's constitutional rights."

Barbara said he expected the case to go before the court of appeals during the October session of the court. Until then the money will not be paid if a stay order is granted by the court, pending the October hearing on the matter.

But, because that promise was never carried out, the planning commission has decided to renege on its portion of the bargain.

"Originally, this was a trade-off item," said planning commission member Bart Berg. "I would again vote for the trade-off, if we could acquire the right-of-way."

CARL PARSELL, township treasurer and planning commission member, added, "We're doing this because we feel single-family residential is the best land use."

The county, Parsell said, will still attempt to obtain a strip of the land for the proposed Sheldon-Canton Center connector.

"The road needs to go through to clear up the traffic and make it safer for the high schools," he said.

The planning commission held a public hearing on the proposed rezoning on May 20. Dembs and Sakwa submitted a letter of opposition to the proposed rezoning. No other person spoke in favor or in opposition to the proposal, according to Parsell.

First step taken to revert zoning for agriculture

CANTON—Planning commission members took first steps Tuesday night toward rezoning land parcels in the western portion of the township back to their original land use designations—agriculture.

Owners of the land parcels, who bought the acreage for speculative or development purposes, voiced their gripes over the plan at a scheduled public hearing. Planning commission members will formulate their zoning recommendation to the board of trustees at their July 15 meeting.

LAND parcels considered for the agricultural rezoning are:

- Eight acres, zoned commercial in May, 1974, at the southwest corner of Ridge and Ford Roads.

- A total of 80 acres, zoned single family in November 1974, at the southwest corner of Geddes and Beck Roads.

- About 125 acres, now zoned single family and located north of Geddes and east and west of Beck.

The land parcels were rezoned from agriculture to more intensive purposes by a previous planning commission and board of trustees action in preparation for a land use plan proposed last fall. That plan has been discarded, however, and a new proposed land use plan will be unveiled in July.

"The land use plan is not solidified yet," said township Clerk John Flodin, "but this rezoning land back to agricultural has been talked about a great deal in our land use plan."

"There's an effort to leave substantial portions of Canton Township in agriculture. The logic is if all the agriculture land is gone, we can't munch on carrots."

BUT LANDOWNERS, who bought acreage for speculative or development purposes, do not appreciate that type of logic.

"In all the years I've been before planning boards and in the land business, I never heard of a massacre like this," said one landowner, who owns 80 acres at the southwest corner of Geddes and Beck. "When I was coming here tonight, I felt like I was coming to my own wake."

"With the climate in Canton Township today, I would run for my life and get all the money I could for that land, if it is rezoned agricultural. A nightmare is taking place in this community. All the developers in Canton Township feel the same way today."

Large areas of agricultural land would ruin the township's tax base, he said.

TOWNSHIP PLANNER Michael Manore disagreed.

Agricultural land, he noted, does not yield high tax dollars, but it does not demand expensive services. Subdivisions, on the other hand, demand many services for the tax dollars they create.

"The balance for single family houses is usually negative."

Planning commission member Flossie Tonda said: "When you build a subdivision around a farm, it's awfully hard for the farmer to farm. There's not much farmland left."

John Wells represented Equitable Development Corp., owner of land north of Geddes on both sides of Beck, at Tuesday's public hearing. "We are opposed to the zoning change," Wells told planning commission members. "The current zoning represents a well-balanced land use plan. This land can't be considered as

agricultural land. In a good year, the crops on this land would probably pay only half of the taxes."

Equitable Development Corp., Wells said, had planned to build a planned unit development (PUD) on the land.

"The present owner has a very significant economic interest in preserving the present zoning. No one would buy that land for farming. I come from a long line of farmers, and I'm sure no expert would describe that land as a valuable agricultural resource."

AN ATTORNEY, representing the owner of eight acres at Ridge and Ford, also protested the proposed rezoning. His client, he said, had bought the land last year, after it had been rezoned commercial.

"I don't think there's much of a market for an eight-acre farm today. Agricultural would be the least desirable on this tract, because there's much commercial development along Ford Road. I have to believe that this is where it's going in the future."

One township resident, who lives on Saltz west of Canton Center, spoke in favor of preserving agricultural land.

"We're very happy with our agricultural land and we want it to stay that way."

Supervisor Robert Greenstein sat in the audience at Tuesday's meeting and responded to one vocal landowner, who opposed the proposed rezoning: "As far as the speculator is concerned, it seems good to take good, raw agricultural land and divide it into 60-foot lots. But it's not so fair to go the opposite way."



Trees to be rooted

CANTON—Trees, the bicentennial and the year 1776 will soon be firmly rooted in the township's earth for future generations project to plant 1,776 trees in the township, and all that's needed are the trees.

John Cojei, the member of Canton's bicentennial commission who conceived the tree project, said a few groups have already offered to donate trees or financial support. Persons who wish to donate trees, money or labor are asked to contact Canton Township offices, 44508 Geddes.

TWO LEDGERS, now awaiting donations in township hall, will record the names of donors and the location and type of donated trees for the benefit of future generations.

"We want to know just what the public response is," explained Cojei. "The ledgers are initial feelers and records."

To spur interest and support for the project, the bicentennial commission has formulated Canton's own bicentennial symbol. The symbol, conceived by Cojei and drawn by commission member Frederick J. Magaldi, features a white symbol of a tree on a blue and red background. A green stripe, symbolizing life and growth, bands the symbol.

Bicentennial commission members hope to use the emblem with an accompanying slogan on bumper stickers, decals and clothing patches as a fund-raising project and promotional device. Local junior achievement groups could use the emblem to make T-shirts or other articles of clothing, Cojei said.

Canton Township has already adopted the symbol. A modified version of the bicentennial emblem will appear as letterheads on township stationery through the end of 1976.

PERSONS WHO donate trees, money or services to the tree-planting project will receive a certificate from the bicentennial commission for thanks, and their names will be recorded for history.

Cojei thought of the tree-planting project last January, when he was driving through the township. What better way is there to celebrate the bicentennial, he thought than plant 1,776 trees.

"It's just the fact that we're destroying so many trees with building. It seemed a natural for a project—something we could preserve for the future."

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Geake eyes medical services bills

LANSING—Four bills intended to improve emergency medical services (EMS) in Michigan will get quick legislative action in the opinion of Rep. Robert Geake. (R-Northville).

The problems he foresees are financial and in the ability of local governments to pool resources and to establish a regional or county structure for EMS operations.

Geake, whose 35th District includes most of Livonia, is a member of a joint senate-house committee engaged in revising and updating all Michigan laws pertaining to health.

The four EMS bills are due for introduction in the legislature June 24, he said.

THE FIRST proposal, known as the Ambulance Operations Act, would license ambulances for emergency services, including medical equipment within the vehicle, as well as for mechanical condition.

"The purpose is to upgrade the ambulances," Geake said. "Those now in service would stay in service with current equipment, but any new ambulances would have to be up to national standards as set by the U. S. Department of Transportation."

THE SECOND bill, called the Emergency Medical Services Personnel Act, would upgrade personnel from ambulance attendants to emergency ambulance technicians.

The ambulance attendant is required now to have 56 hours of training, Geake explained, whereas 81 hours are required for an emergency ambulance technician. Courses are taught under the direction of the State Department of Public Health.

The bill would require all ambulances to carry two emergency medical technicians by 1980. Present law requires only one attendant and one driver.

A **THIRD** proposal would require a team of hospital officials to rate each hospital in the state on its capacity to give emergency services.

Geake called this bill "highly controversial" and said it is opposed by "a number of hospitals, especially in Detroit."

"The hospitals want voluntarily to rate their own emergency rooms and to certify to the state how prepared they are," he said.

The fourth proposal, known as the Emergency Medical Services Systems Act, is found objectionable by some suburbs, Geake said.

The bill would establish statewide planning for EMS within eight regions and would standardize and coordinate services throughout the state.

Opponents want regions to be more independent, the Republican legislator said.

Although Geake sees a regional or county structure as the "only logical way" to operate an efficient EMS, he also has some questions.

"The Detroit region would include everything west of Ann Arbor, and I question whether that would not be

too large an area to accomplish the purpose," he said.

PRESENT EMERGENCY medical services and contracted ambulance services are unable to answer the need, Geake said.

"They are handicapped by more and more restrictions on training and equipment," he said. "Personnel are poorly paid."

"Some ambulances don't have proper brakes and tires, let alone interior equipment needs."

Nor are ambulance operators wholly to blame, he said. "There are studies which show that up to 50 per cent of patients being transported never pay. Operators are hopeful that a state operation would guarantee their being paid."

"We know about the 911 delays in Detroit and the inability of some smaller communities to contract for ambulance services."

"One thing of which we should be certain is that all persons, regardless of where they live, in a rural area or a particular suburb, should be assured of uniformly good services."

County OK's 5 legal programs

WAYNE COUNTY—While denying continuation of one law enforcement grant program costing \$13,500, the Board of Commissioners approved general fund financing through the fiscal year for five others, totalling \$534,300.

The only grant to be vetoed by the board in a 13-9 vote was a request from the Prosecuting Attorney for continued funding of an office administrator.

Voting in favor of the program was Mary Dumas (R-Livonia). Commissioners Tom Taylor (D-Westland), Richard Manning (D-Redford Township) and Royce Smith (D-Belle Isle) voted against the measure. Commissioner John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights) was absent.

THE BOARD passed by a 14-8 vote continuation of the Prosecutor's Consumer Protection Unit at a cost of \$193,415.

The commissioners went against the Board of Auditors' recommendation responsibility to provide such services other than to prosecute criminal fraud cases. The consumer unit handles both criminal and non-criminal cases.

In a 14-8 vote, Mrs. Dumas recinded her original pass and voted yes as did Richard Manning. Smith and Taylor voted no.

THE RECORDER'S Court Probation Services Program will be funded through the fiscal year at a cost of \$155,913 following a 17-4 vote by the commissioners.

The goals of the program include offering treatment and supervision of drug dependent defendants; reduction of the probation department's caseload of addicts and narcotic users, and treatment and rehabilitation of convicted drug abuse probationers.

Voting yes on the measure were Manning, Taylor, and Mrs. Dumas who rescinded her no vote. Smith voted against the funding.

BY A 21-1 vote, the commissioners approved \$132,000 funding of the Metro Narcotic Squad Program of the Wayne County Sheriff.

Included in the program is the training of police in Wayne County in drug enforcement, drug prevention education in schools and arrest of suspects for the illegal sale and possession of narcotics.

Commissioners Dumas, Smith, Taylor and Manning voted yes.

THE COUNTY will continue the Detroit Wayne County Criminal Justice System Coordinating Council program for 90 days. It also will appropriate \$12,000 as required in matching funds to Law Enforcement Administration Agency (LEAA) and HEW funds.

Because the LEAA appropriation bill is currently before Congress with final action doubtful by June 30, the county agreed to the extension.

The vote was 20-2. Manning, Taylor, Smith and Mrs. Dumas voted with the majority.

By a 21-2 vote, the county approved \$41,000 funding for the Metropolitan Helicopter Program from the Wayne County Sheriff's Department. Commissioners Taylor, Smith, Manning and Dumas voted yes. Mrs. Dumas originally passed on the motion.

Pursell named rep to national meeting

State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), whose district includes Redford Township, Plymouth and Livonia, has been selected as the Legislature's representative to the National Conference of State Legislatures.

According to Pursell, the conference will supply up-to-date information on technical, educational and political topics designed to improve legislative operations.

Pursell helped instigate a computer data system for the State Department of Education which makes information readily available for fiscal review.

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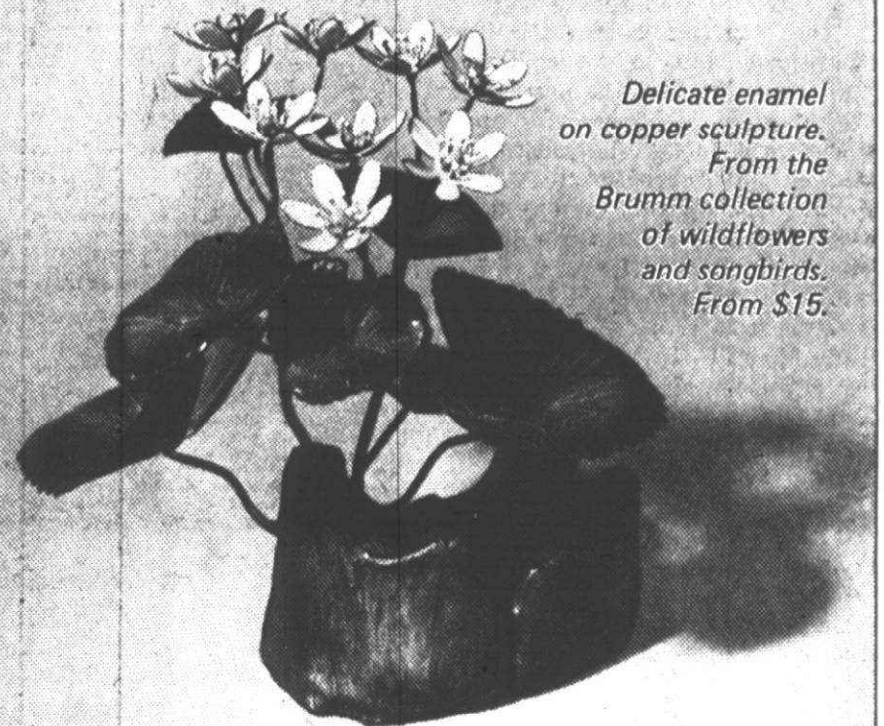
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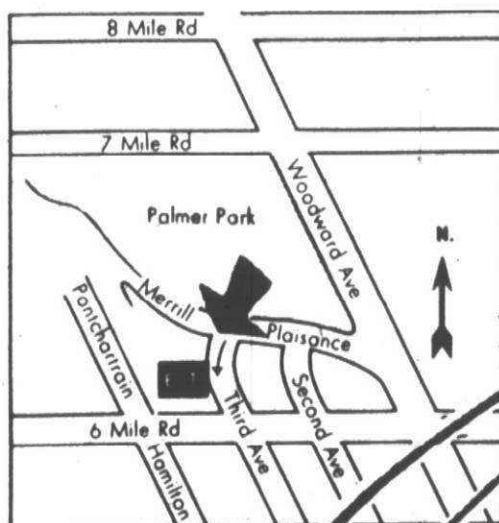

Model United Nations assembly is held

CANTON— Amid the hustle and bustle of its annual meeting and occasional assassination attempts, the General Assembly of the United Nations Thursday took several actions to avert a worldwide famine and expanded the U.N.'s Security Council.

Packed with students swathed in Arab headdresses, Indian saris and formal British suits, the Plymouth Salem High School gym cast off its athletic appearance for the Centennial Educational Park's Model U.N. Day.

Seated at long, curving tables with identifying name tags before them, the 120 students representing more than 70 nations presented and voted upon resolutions as their representative countries would have done.

"The experience is really very educational and inter-disciplinary," said Jerry Morris, who acts as the Park's area coordinator for social studies and foreign languages and teaches an international relations course. "The students learn politics of nations, and they learn how to deal with each other. In terms of writing resolutions and speech, the experience is very good."

The Model U.N. Day, sponsored by the Plymouth schools for about 15 years now, marks a final educational experience for the Park's three international relations classes.

OPEN TO ALL students at Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools, the United Nations event is run by international relations students, who select the topics of debate and elect U.N. co-presidents.

Students, Morris said, were encouraged to write or research the coun-

tries they were representing in order to vote on issues as actual U.N. representatives.

Resolutions and opinions concerning the worldwide food problem and

amendments to the U.N. charter were tossed about the floor at this year's annual meeting, chaired by co-presidents Bill Silaghi and Bill Marks.

Tidbits of horseplay and "tension politics" occasionally interrupted the otherwise serious meeting and brought down the co-presidents' gavels. The Arab delegation twice interrupted the packed meeting in attempts to kidnap the United States representative and assassinate the delegate from Japan.

"IT WAS A VERY alarming experience," confided U.S. representative Phillip Schulte of the kidnap attempt. "I feared mostly for my calculator."

But, all in all, the day-long meeting marked a genuine attempt to "solve" the world's problems and imitate the U.N.'s parliamentary procedure.

"I find it very interesting," said senior Schulte of the Model U.N. Day and his seat as the U.S. representative. "I also find it necessary. There's so much interrelationship between nations that we have to learn to cooperate better."

Schulte represented Brazil at last year's Model U.N. Day, but this year got first pick of countries to represent as a member of the Park's international relations courses.

"The first ones to go this year were the Arab countries," he said. "But I was looking forward to representing the United States since last year. I'm familiar with American politics. I read every newspaper I can get a hold of."

Senior Robert DeLano gave loud vocal representation to Upper Volta, a

small country in Africa. DeLano has chosen to represent Upper Volta for three years in a row.

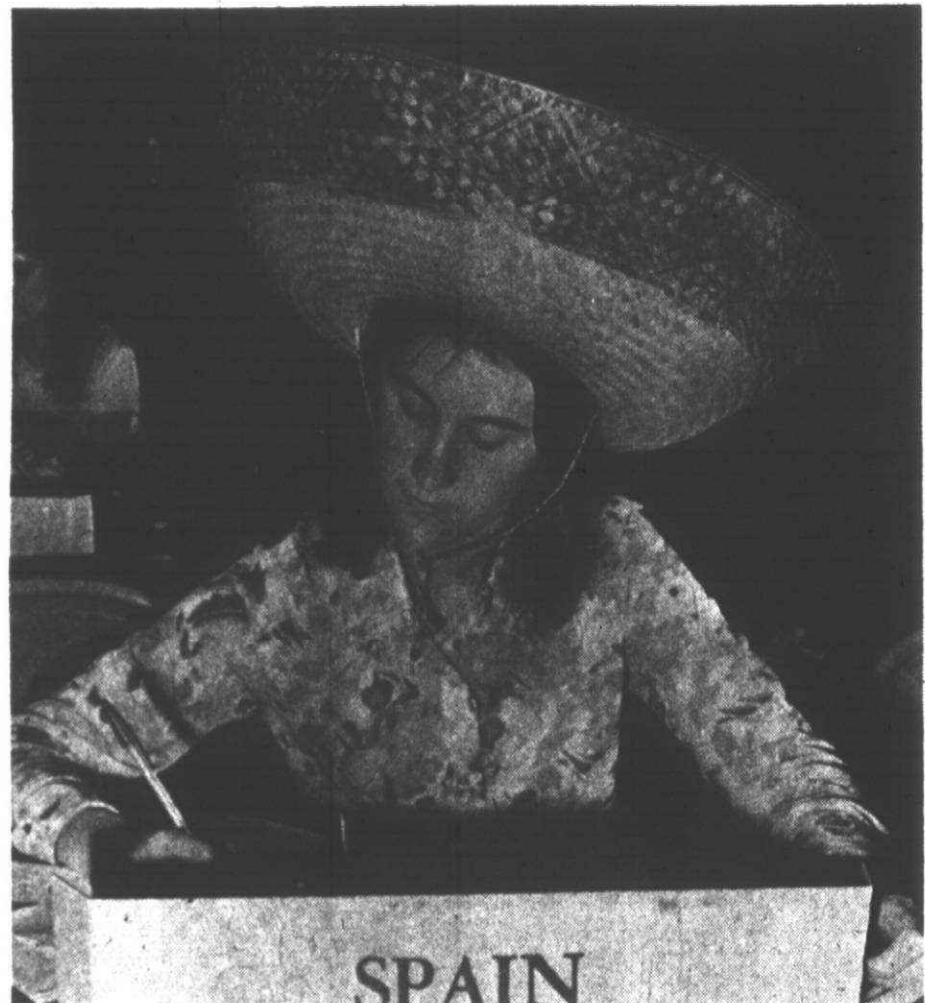
"I STUCK WITH IT, because I did a lot of research on it," DeLano explained. "It's a dinky little country that no one's ever heard of. You can have lots of fun with it."

Other students enjoyed representing the more powerful countries.

Postal box rates hiked

Details are being ironed out on Canton consumers bureau

CANTON—The newly-formed Consumer Relations Bureau of the Canton Chamber of Commerce is ready to take consumers' complaints and attempt to settle them.

Consumers with complaints against Canton businesses will be encouraged to work out their problems with businessmen before filing a complaint with the Chamber of Commerce.

IF THE PROBLEM cannot be settled to the consumer's satisfaction, the consumer and the Chamber of Commerce will take these steps:

- The consumer will file a written complaint with the Chamber of Commerce and state all facets of the complaint. The chamber will forward a copy of the complaint to the business involved. Complaint forms are available at the chamber office, 41652 Ford.

- The chamber's community development committee will consult the business and attempt to settle the complaint.

- If an acceptable agreement cannot be reached, the chamber will contact the Wayne County Consumer Protection Agency and forward all information to the county.

- The chamber will keep an ongoing file of all complaints against Canton businesses. The chamber will encourage consumers to contact the chamber office before broaching their complaints to businessmen.

Bart Berg, president of Canton's three-year-old chamber, says consumer protection divisions exist in most chambers of commerce.

The township's proposal to establish a consumer protection agency that would license and regulate businesses prompted the establishment of the Canton Chamber's Consumer Relations Bureau, according to Berg.

"This was in response to the township's proposal," Berg said. "This is our way to give Canton the same type of protection without it costing anything."

"We know there are many fly-by-night companies. 'But when you put a complaint on paper, I think about 75 per cent of the complaints disappear. A three-person committee will contact merchants to see what their side of the story is. I wager we won't have to turn anything over to Wayne County."

ACTION ON the township's proposed consumer protection agency is awaiting opinions of legality from township attorneys William Sempliner and Bert Burgoyne.

Sempliner found the consumer ordinance, drafted by attorney Peter Bundarin at Trustee Robert Myers' request, illegal in April.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein asked Sempliner to reconsider the legality of the document, which is based on an or-

dinance in effect in Prince Georges County, Maryland.

The ordinance, if approved, would establish a consumer protection agency with the right to license and regulate businesses. The ordinance would establish the fee schedule and the specifics of licensing.

Businessmen opposed to the proposed ordinance at a public hearing in April. The ordinance, they said, would duplicate services already offered by the Better Business Bureau and the Wayne County Consumer Protection Agency. It would overlicense them "to death," they said.

PLYMOUTH—The groundbreaking ceremony for the three new elementary buildings to be built by Plymouth Community Schools will be Sunday, June 22.

The schools are being built from proceeds of a bond sale approved by school district voters last fall.

Skyjacker arrested

The man who skyjacked the helicopter piloted by a Westland man from Mettetal Airport, Plymouth, in the Jackson State Prison escape has been arrested at a travelling carnival in Garden City, Kan.

Morris E. Colosky, 21, has been identified by FBI agents as the person who hijacked the helicopter and ordered the pilot to fly it to Jackson. Arrested at the same time was an alleged accomplice, Mrs. Gertrude Woodbury, 43. Both are from Webberville, a small town between Brighton and Lansing.

The two arrests June 17 mean all seven persons involved in the escape of Dale Remling have been caught, reports the FBI.

Law officials report Mrs. Woodbury allegedly recruited the seven persons, including one of her sons, and may have been the driver of one of the four get-away cars involved in the escape.

Both had been hired by Midwest Shows about a week ago. Colosky, using an alias, was earning \$125 a week operating a roller coaster.

Persons eligible for the exemption will receive rebates on 1974-75 Michigan property taxes.

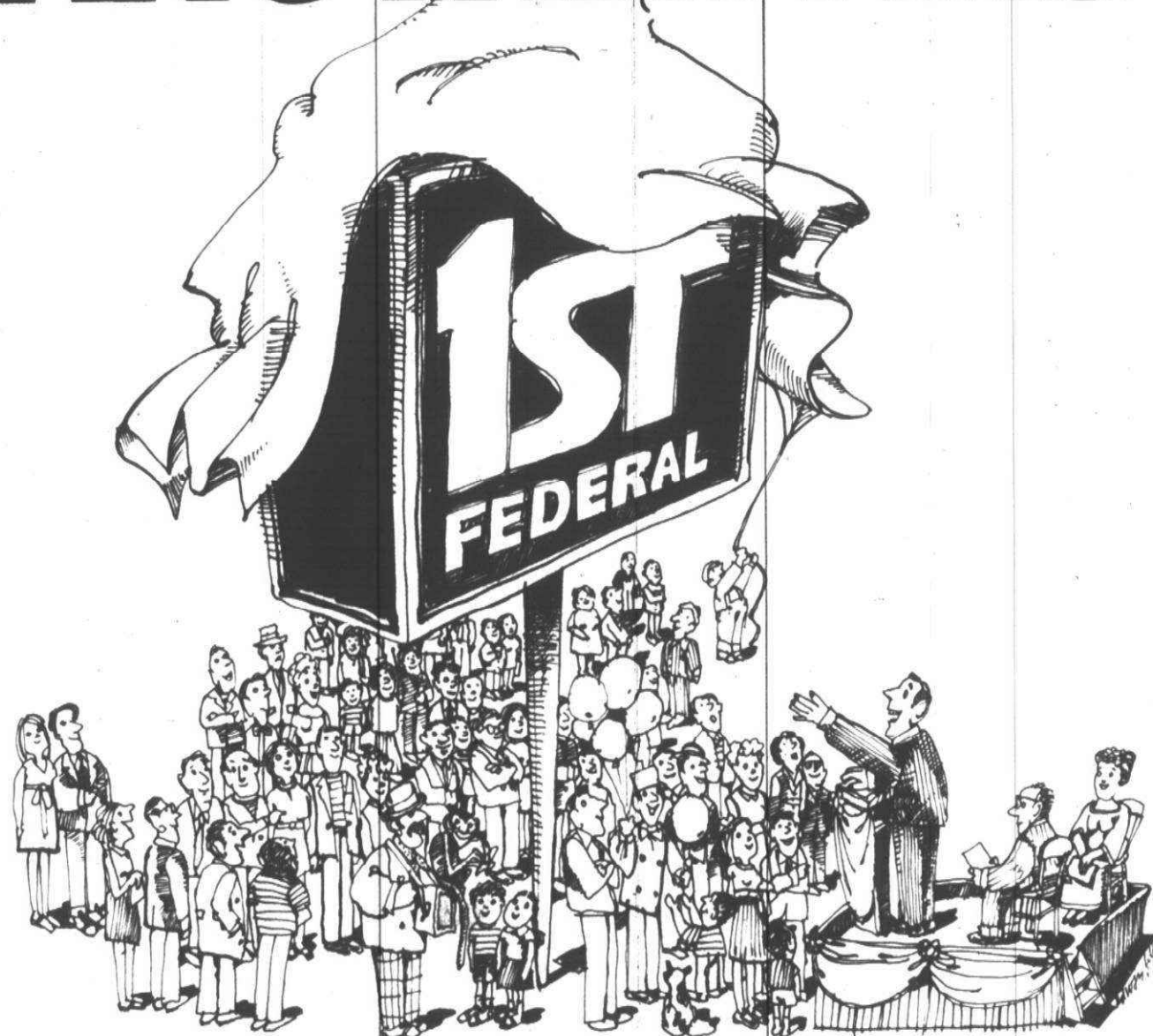
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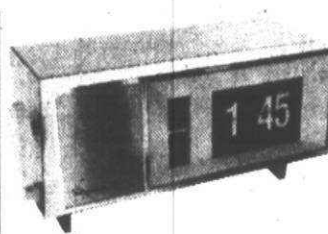

Grant seen as first step toward state court funding

WAYNE COUNTY — A \$1.3 million grant from the Michigan Legislature has been described as "the first step toward state financing of the courts in Wayne County" by Roscoe L. Bobo, chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

The grant will help finance the \$3.5 million annual budget of Common Pleas Court — one of five courts financed in whole or part by the county. Court operations will cost county taxpayers \$33 million this year.

BOBO PRAISED the fact that the

Legislature rejected a move by some outstate legislators to reduce the grant to \$650,000.

"Approval of the full amount shows a strong commitment on the part of the Legislature — a commitment to the residents of Michigan's largest county and to the concept of a single court system with equal justice for all."

He expressed gratitude to legislators from Wayne County for their work on behalf of the grant, singling out Rep. Richard A. Young (D-Dearborn Heights) and Rep. William A. Ryan (D-Detroit). Bobo also praised the Common Pleas bench, County Board of Auditors, and members of the County Board of Commissioners who worked to secure the grant.

Other courts funded by the county include Wayne Circuit, Detroit Recorder's, Probate, and Juvenile Court which is a division of Probate Court.

"This grant was approved as an interim measure," says Bobo, "pending full state assumption of the costs of the courts in line with the 1963 Constitution which established the concept of a single statewide court system."

"District courts in the suburbs receive partially state financing and the majority in the Legislature agreed it is only fair that some state funding for Common Pleas be provided because Common Pleas functions much like a district court for the City of Detroit."

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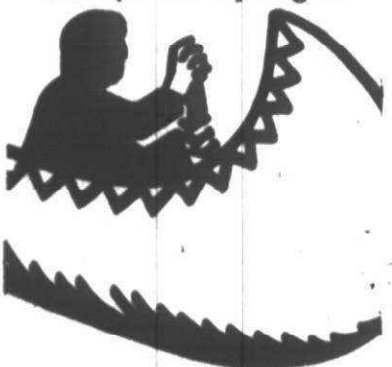
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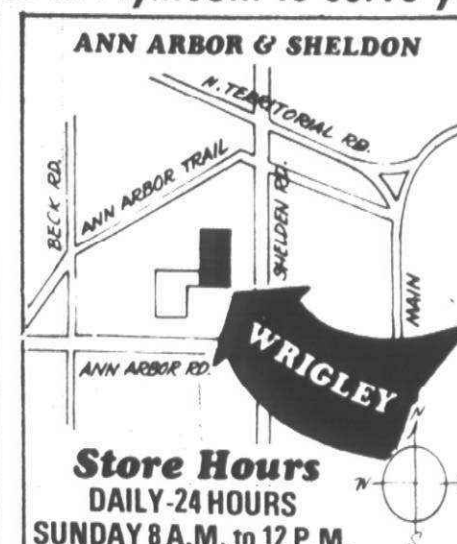
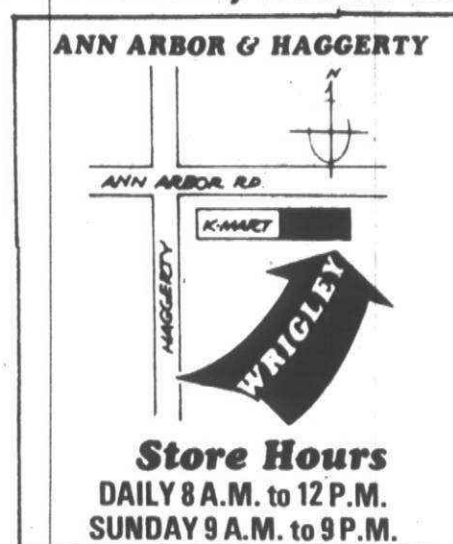
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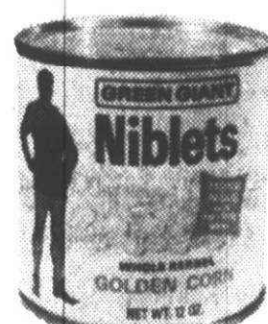


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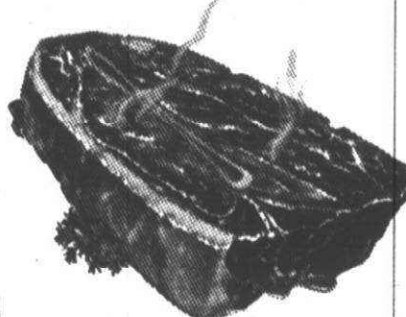
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Managers' raises delayed by county

WAYNE COUNTY—The Board of Commissioners has sent back to its Labor Board a salary adjustment proposal for the Wayne County Supervisory Employees Association.

In a bizarre vote June 16 in which the item was defeated for tabling and passage twice each, commissioners

weighed the question of a possible strike of county personnel against being able to pay for the package.

Pushing for passage of the proposal was Commissioner Richard Manning (D-Redford Township), whose district includes Redford Township and part of Livonia.

"It's not enough to table this item

and it's not enough to vote this issue down," Manning said.

"Tabling the question is just passing the agony on to the county which expects to have supervisory personnel giving orders to other county employees.

"We are bound to the bargaining process which we carried on with this union.

"On July 1 these people will not have a contract and they may or may not continue to work."

TOM TAYLOR (D-Westland) pressed to have the issue brought back to the board in September when it will consider the 4½ per cent pay raise for elected officials, their deputies and non-union personnel.

"I want to see what our total package is going to be in September," Taylor said. "You can't expect the union to go back into negotiations when they know the labor board is going to try to reduce their offer."

The final vote to accept the pay increases was defeated 10-9 with two abstentions. Manning voted yes on the measure, Taylor, Mary Dumas (R-Livonia) and Royce Smith (D-Belleville) voted no. John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights), whose district includes part of Westland, was absent.

HAD THE measure passed, the Supervisory Association would have included two proposed agreements providing "negotiated salary adjustments for certain classifications."

Estimated cost for these adjustments is \$118,600 for July 1, 1974 to June 30, 1975, and \$49,000 for July 1, 1975 to Nov. 30.

The second agreement extends the association's existing contract for one year beginning July 1 through June 30, 1976, and provides for a general salary adjustment of 4½ per cent effective July 1, 1975. Cost of the 4½ per cent adjustment is \$77,000.

Officials' postponed pay raises

WAYNE COUNTY—All elected county officials except county commissioners, their deputies and 511 non-union employees will forego a 4½ per cent pay raise—at least for the time being.

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners Monday tabled the item until September, when they indicated they hope to have a better idea of the county's fiscal picture.

Cost of the package is estimated at \$227,365.

Leading the delaying proposal was chairman Roscoe Bobo, who said the

county's deficit has ballooned from \$4 million in November to \$8 million presently.

"We've reached a crisis situation," Bobo said. "We must protect ourselves from having to lay off county employees and protect the services of the citizens."

Commissioner Tom Taylor (D-Westland), whose district also includes Garden City, said he "welcomes Bobo to the small group of commissioners who have been sounding the warning all along."

"My only regret is that this has to

come two pages into the agenda too late," Taylor said, referring to the number of commissioners including vice chairman John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights) who were not present for the vote. Barr's district includes part of Westland.

COMMISSIONER Mary Dumas (R-Livonia) predicted county would soon find itself in the same position as Detroit which recently laid off 700 employees.

"The function of county government is not only as an employer but to provide a service to its residents," Mrs. Dumas said.

"We should be seriously considering that we can't compete with Detroit which is second only to Chicago in relation to its employee pay rate.

"We're not in the same league with Detroit or Chicago. If we continue to pay our employees the way, they do then we're going to be bankrupt."

The precise subject the grand jury

Brodhead balks on Nedzi vote

WASHINGTON—Congressional delegations from Wayne and Oakland counties were among the staunch supporters of Rep. Lucien Nedzi (D-Detroit) whose chairmanship of the Select Committee on Intelligence was challenged Monday.

Only Rep. William Brodhead (D-Detroit), whose 17th District includes Redford Township, Farmington and Southfield, cast a vote with the minority (290-64 with 44 voting "present") to oust the 14-year veteran.

Congressmen voting to maintain Nedzi as chairman of the factionalized committee included: William Blanchard (D-Troy); William Ford (D-Taylor), whose district includes Westland, Garden City, Canton Township and part of Livonia; James O'Hara (D-Utica), whose district includes Rochester and part of Avon Township.

Republicans voting with the majority included: William Broomfield of Bloomfield Township, whose district

includes western Oakland County; and Marvin Esch of Ann Arbor, whose district includes Plymouth and most of Livonia.

The challenge came from a group of dissidents on Nedzi's committee investigating the CIA. Nedzi, they argued, was in a compromised position because he had been privy to CIA secrets while chairman of an intelligence oversight subcommittee

and generally supports its operations.

Brodhead has been identified as one of a "young Turk" group of new congressmen seeking to reform many House practices.

Yet to be decided is whether Nedzi's committee can effectively operate or whether the CIA investigation will fall only to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Operations.

Bus routes are altered

Senior citizens may travel for half-fare Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., after 6 p.m. and before 6 a.m., and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

The current route begins at Wayne County Hospital, south on Henry Carlslyle to Inkster Road, north on Inkster Road to Ann Arbor Trail, west on Ann Arbor Trail to Middle Belt, north on Middle Belt to the Livonia Mall, and east on Seven Mile to Grand River.

These services are supported by SEMTA with funds received through the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation from the state gasoline tax increase of a half cent per gallon for public transportation.

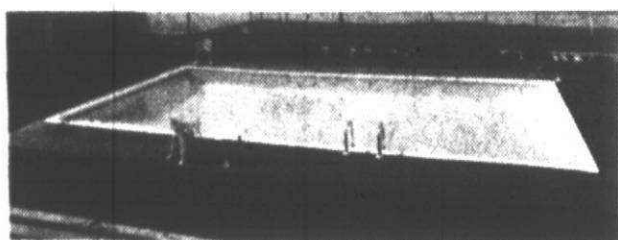

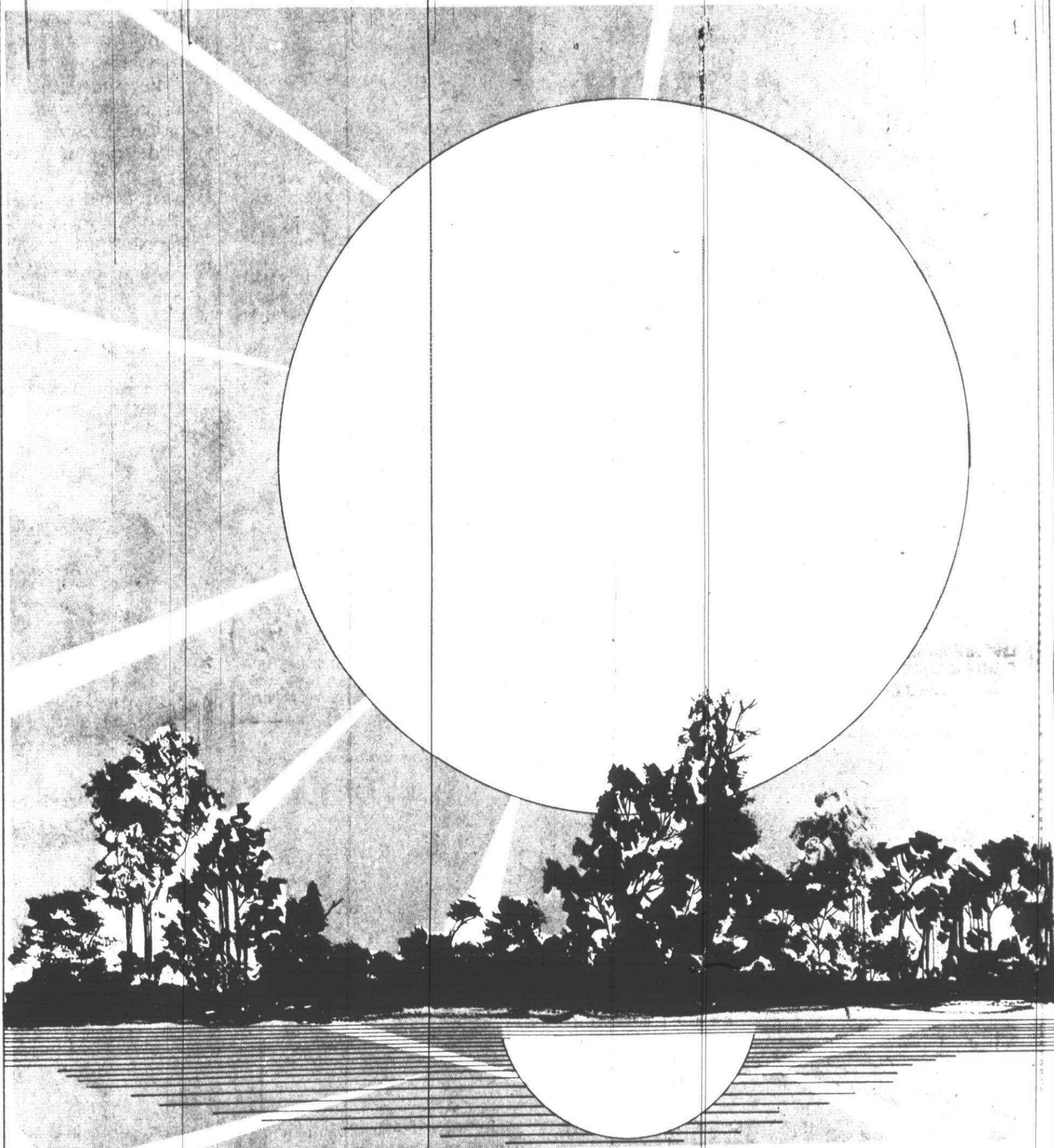

School enrollment in county to drop by 15,000 students

WAYNE COUNTY — The jobs of about 600 teachers in Wayne County are threatened by an expected enrollment decline of more than 45,000 students in the county.

Based on actual enrollments in September of last year, the superintendents of the 36 local school districts in the county have estimated expected

enrollment will decline by about three per cent for 1975-76.

Total enrollment next year is expected to be 514,000 in the county compared to 529,000 this year.

LIVONIA SCHOOL District has already given layoff notices to 421 teachers, informing them they may not

have a job when school opens next fall.

Livonia, second largest district in Wayne County, is expected to lose 1,953 students next year with the 34,333 enrollment this year dropping to 32,380.

The largest percentage loss in enrollment is anticipated for Garden City, Crestwood and Allen Park districts whose student bodies will decline by about eight per cent.

Garden City's student count of 11,335 this year is expected to drop to 10,606. Garden City already has closed one elementary building and made it available to Schoolcraft College for a satellite campus. The district is negotiating with Schoolcraft for use of another building as a campus center.

Redford Union, which has given layoff notices to 21 instructors, expects to lose 452 students from this year's enrollment of 7,802. South Redford expects to lose 362 students from its 1974-75 student count of 5,630.

Wayne-Westland School District, which serves the cities of Wayne and Westland plus part of Canton Township, foresees a student loss of 353 from this year's enrollment of 23,153. The district is the third largest in Wayne County.

PLYMOUTH COMMUNITY School District is one of five districts in the county which will experience an increase in enrollment next year.

Plymouth's student body is expected to increase by five per cent, from 12,656 to 13,300. The district serves the City of Plymouth, Plymouth Township and part of Canton Township which is one of the fastest growing areas in terms of single family residential units in southeastern Michigan.

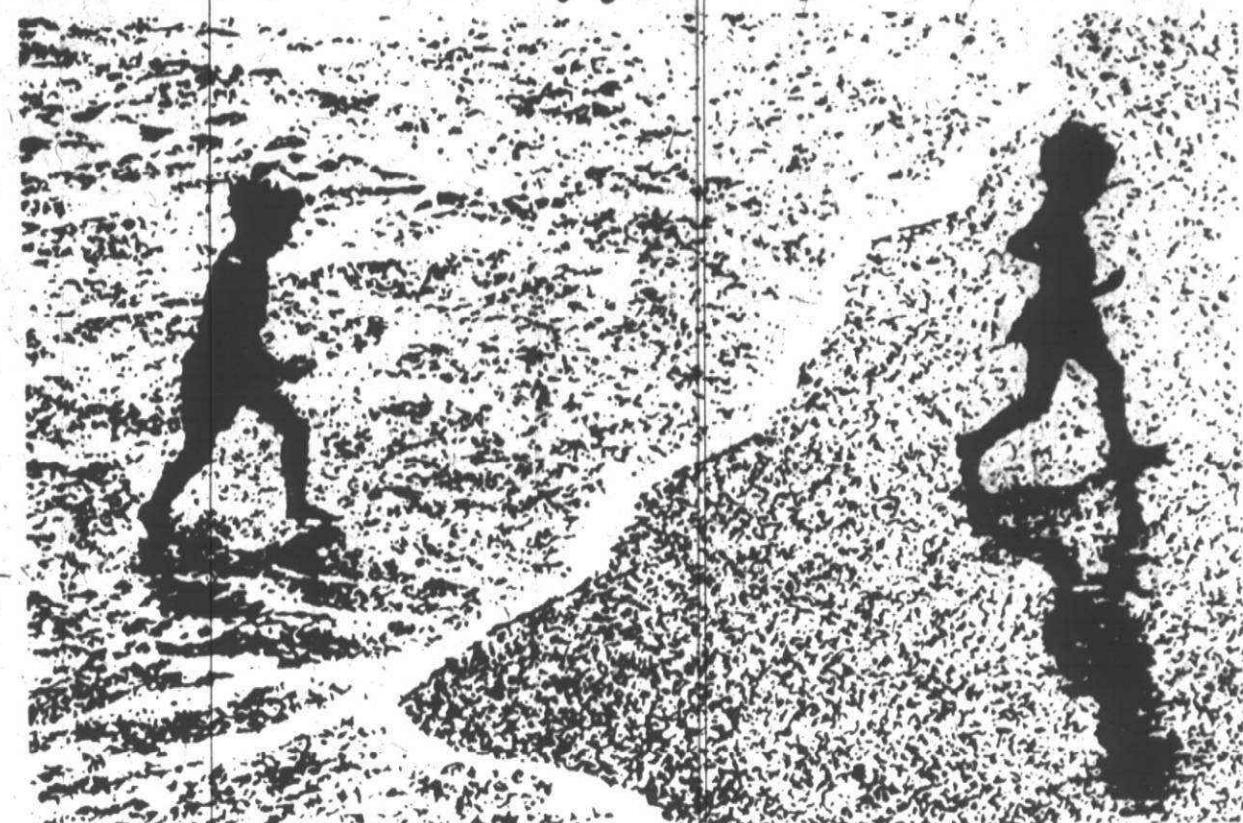
The other districts forecasting gains in enrollment are Woodhaven, 12 per cent, Huron, 8.6 per cent, Romulus, 2.8 per cent, and Gilmart, 4 per cent. Romulus has 6,660 students and the other three have less than 4,000 students.

THE LARGEST number will be lost in Detroit School District where enrollment is expected to drop from 261,000 to 253,000, a three per cent decline.

"The drop in enrollment, which follows a pattern of several years, reflects a lower birth rate recorded during recent years," says Dr. William Simmons, superintendent of the Wayne County Intermediate District.

A number of districts, besides Livonia and Redford Union, have already notified significant numbers of teachers they may not be re-hired next fall.

Lay aside summer's work for Midsummer festival

My favorite Shakespearean play has never been "Hamlet," "Macbeth" nor even "Romeo and Juliet." I much prefer the merry comedy of "A Midsummer Night's Dream."

The enchantments, the love spells, the magical mixups caused by frolicking fairies are all reminiscent of the folk tales from many lands about the mysterious things that can happen on Midsummer Night.

Today there is some confusion as to whether June 21 or June 24 should rightfully be called Midsummer Day. June 21 is the longest day of the year, the summer solstice. This was the day on which pagan people laid aside their hard summer work for a while for the fun and frolic of the Midsummer festival.

FROM JUNE 21 on, the hours of sunlight diminish. So on the third day after the solstice, great fires were lighted and rituals held to "strengthen the sun," much like the bale fires



burned on February 2 to call the sun back for spring.

The vigor and extent of the crops were believed to be governed by the height of the flames. People would join hands and jump over the flames. Leaping of this kind was a common folk custom intended to stimulate the crops by example. The higher they jumped, the higher they believed the crops would grow.

When the early Christian church was attempting to convert pagans, June 24 was proclaimed the eve of the

birth of St. John the Baptist. Thus, pagans could become Christians and still celebrate this date by lighting fires. Only now the fires were lighted to honor St. John and were called Johnmas fires.

In ancient times, witches, along with other pagan groups, celebrated the Midsummer festival. However, it is considered a "minor" or "lesser" sabbat among modern witches, and there is disagreement from coven to coven, even among the most traditional, as to which night (June 21 or 24) should be celebrated, because both were once part of the pagan Midsummer festival which lasted several days. As a result, many no longer observe it at all, since it is not one of the "major" or "greater" sabbats.

ALTHOUGH MOST dictionaries list June 24 as Midsummer, and that is the day the coven to which I belong recognizes (but seldom celebrates), June 21 was the day we observed when I was a child.

On that night each person would break a hen's egg, and one's future would be read from the splattered egg much the same way as people read tea leaves. It was also customary for young girls to sleep with yarrow under their pillow in order to dream of their future mates.

Fernseed gathered on Midsummer Day, and properly used, was said to make men invisible. Shakespeare referred to this custom in "Henry IV" Part 1: "We have the receipt of fern seed. We walk invisible."

My grandmother always allowed us to stay up late on June 21 to watch the fairies dance at midnight. Wrapped in blankets, because June nights in northern Michigan can be cold, we would sit quietly beneath the trees watching the open field across the way.

The older folks had told us so many tales about fairies and elves dancing beneath the moon at midnight that I could almost imagine I really saw them, although my brother always said they were just lightening bugs in the tall wet grass.

Maybe you'd like to watch for them yourself on this Midsummer's Night. But don't be too disappointed if you don't see them; those fairies may be using the fernseed.

Tuition-incentive established for student involvement

A tuition-incentive program to encourage student participation in college activities has been approved, with immediate effect, by the board of trustees of Wayne County Community College (WCCC).

Under the program, 25 scholarships will be provided to student participating in four student activities — editors of the student newspaper; members of the student publication board; student government and student activities chairpersons; college standing committee members; and student review council representatives.

To be eligible, students must be enrolled full-time (12 credit hours) except upon recommendation of the vice-president for student services.

The scholarships cover 50 per cent of the full tuition for two consecutive

semesters and will be automatically awarded to students the semester following their participation in the above categories.

Total annual cost of the program is expected to be about \$5,000 which will be absorbed into the current cost of instruction.

The board also approved appointment of James T. Sleet to the position of associate director of personnel. An employee of the college since 1969, he served as director of college services before this late appointment.

The board also approved appointment of Ms. Ruth Goldman as interim assistant dean for interdisciplinary studies, which includes Black and women's studies, open studies, and workers' education. She will serve until a permanent appointment is made.

Russian residing in Livonia swaps fish stories

"When you are in this field, this is a great place to work. In manufacturing engineering, they come from all over the world to see how we do things. This is the center."

Jerry Lineberger, regional manager for Ingersoll Rand, is part of the Farmington-based group preparing a section of a truck engine assembly plant for shipment to the Soviet Union.

Born in South Carolina, with a drawl undiminished by 10 years in Detroit, he finds it natural to put an arm around Ed Yugan and talk about his uncle's peanut farm.

Yugan trades off a story about fish-

ing on the Kama River in the Soviet Union. What brought the unlikely pair together is an 800-foot long piece of machinery only recently put into operation in the Farmington Industrial Park at Grand River and 10 Mile Rd.

THE MACHINE is one of five sections of an assembly line which will eventually turn out 50 heavy truck diesels an hour along the banks of the Kama River, 500 miles east of Moscow.

When completely assembled, the line will include 60 automatic and semi-automatic stations which will eventually take in machined parts at one end and produce finished diesels at the other.

The complete operation is being designed and built in the Farmington plant. Ingersoll-Rand will build all the components, including foundations, overhead steel work, and specialized hand tools.

The line will be disassembled for shipping and packed in specialized crates built to resemble small houses. The components may have to stand outside for as long as two years while the remainder of the huge truck plant is completed, according to company officials.

The components are part of a large shipment from several American suppliers going to a new industrial town in the Soviet Union. A complete new city is going up near the site of the 36-square mile industrial complex.

When completed, it is expected to be the largest complex of its type in the world.

Building the assembly line tooling has been a design and construction project for the last two years in the Farmington plant, according to Rand officials.

Negotiations were held in Paris two years ago. As of this time only a single representative has even visited the plant site.

When the line is shipped, a service crew from the United States will spend up to a year getting it in operation.

One off-the-record comment indicated it is not considered a posh assignment. "We never had anybody ask to go back," was one comment.

Main problem seems to be the isolation, combined with the restrictions placed on foreign visitors.

Yugan related a story about 15 technicians who spend an afternoon fishing without a guide on the Kama River, consuming an untold amount of vodka and catching a single perch.

"They went up to a restaurant and had them fry it, then they each had one-fifteenth for supper," along with more vodka.

Yugan is currently living in Livonia with his wife. Two sons remain in the Soviet Union and he said he is anxious to get back. He will move into Naberezhnye Chelny, on the banks of the Kama.

OVERSEAS SHIPMENTS are now accounting for approximately 30 per cent of the company's output, accord-

ing to Paul Pyper, regional sales manager.

"We are looking mainly overseas for new markets," he said, anticipating more international shipments from their Farmington branch.

A varied line of machine tools is being designed and built in the building, recently doubled in size.

They include automated fastening tools suitable for a variety of assembly operations.

In the future are possible plans for additional sections of the Kama plant. The company is also negotiating with General Motors with an eye to the new assembly plant for diesel engines in Romulus.

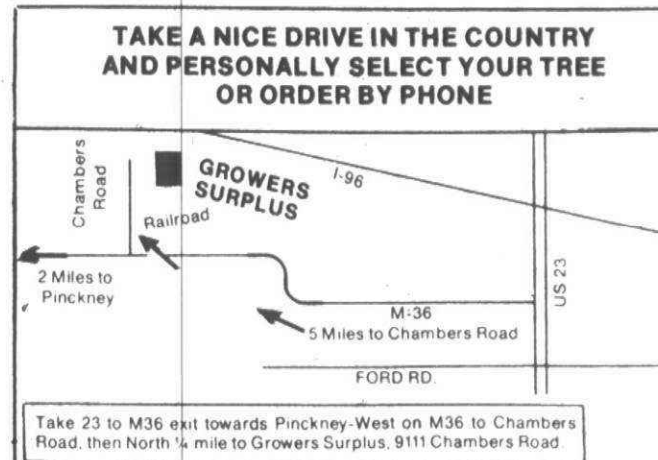

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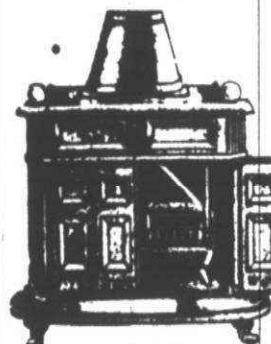

Should serve everyone

SEMTA board OK as is

Two unfortunate developments in recent weeks are casting the shadows of small town politics over the advancing dream of a regional rapid transit system for southeast Michigan.

Oakland County Executive Daniel T. Murphy, in honest criticism of Gov. Milliken's transit proposals, came up with an alternative that was little better than Milliken's unfortunate deal with Detroit.

Murphy proposed the governing board of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) be composed of two persons appointed by Detroit, one each by Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties and two by the governor.

Leave aside the fact that Murphy's proposal violates the constitutional "one man, one vote" principle. What it does is to make the SEMTA board answerable mostly to provincial politicians.

MURPHY'S PLAN is no better than the bad deal Milliken made with Detroit Mayor Coleman Young: Five members appointed by Young, five by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) and three by the governor, with the governor's three subject to veto by six of the 10 Young-SEMCOG members.

The reason both Murphy and Milliken are wrong is that a public transportation system is supposed to serve the entire southeastern Michigan region—seven counties. SEMTA's governing board must think regionally. It can't think regionally if any of its members must answer to provincial politicians.

The political fact of life is that over-all public transportation planning is the sole responsibility of SEMCOG. Not Dan Murphy. Certainly not the perpetually politicking Coleman Young. Not Wayne County, or Oakland County, or Macomb County.

SEMCOG must do the planning, and SEMCOG ought to be appointing at least the majority of SEMTA's board.

By the way, that is precisely what is happening today: SEMTA's nine board members include six appointed by SEM-

COG and three by the governor. That board can be expected to work closely with SEMCOG planners—and it is. This harmonious and fruitful relationship could only be hamstrung by letting Mayor Young and the county boards get into the act.

THE SECOND UNFORTUNATE development was a lavishly publicized acceptance by Mayor Young of some new buses that will be operated by Detroit's Department of Transportation.

The reason Young was so wild for the publicity is that he's trying to build a case for his having power to appoint five SEMTA board members. Young's argument has been that Detroit owns 90 per cent of the buses in the region, so Detroit should have a disproportionate share of SEMTA's political power.

The truth of the matter is that Detroit didn't pay for those buses. Neither did Bill Milliken, Dan Murphy, nor the Wayne, Oakland nor Macomb boards of commissioners. The truth is that the friendly federal government paid for them. That's us—Detroiters, suburbanites, out-staters and the other 49 states.

Because Detroit didn't pay for the buses, Young has little cause for demanding political power over SEMTA to "protect Detroit's investment" because Detroit isn't making any investment.

The public transportation system is supposed to serve all of southeast Michigan—seven counties. SEMTA's governing board must think regionally. That board does think regionally precisely because the seven-county Council of Governments makes all public transportation plans and controls two-thirds of the board's appointments.

SEMTA's governing board is doing all right. It doesn't need to be messed up by either Bill Milliken and Coleman Young or Dan Murphy.

CETA funds misused

In spite of calls for federal programs without strings, local governments have a way of destroying what begins with good intentions.

A classic example is the way some local governments have allocated funds from the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) which Congress passed to combat unemployment.

Suburban municipal governments, school districts and county governments receive CETA funds specifically to hire persons currently unemployed and train them in new job skills. In theory, persons are put to work, the unemployment rate shrinks, the state pays out less in unemployment compensation, and more money begins circulating in an economy which badly needs new spending.

THAT'S THE THEORY, at least in Washington, DC, where the act was passed and money appropriated to local governments. But back home, local governments caught up in the recession are faced with fixed incomes and rising costs.

As a result, some local units have reduced their regular permanent work force and have hired CETA employees to perform the same labor.

In Redford Township, vacancies have occurred in the regular work force through retirement or death. The township has left the positions unfilled and has brought in CETA employees to perform the work. In Westland, two permanent employees were laid off and then recalled by using the CETA funds to pay their salaries.

At Wayne County General Hospital in Westland, there were initial fears that permanent employees would be laid off and their labor performed by CETA laborers. That, apparently, will not be the case, but the fear is held by some employees with 20 to 25 years seniority.

Emory Daniels Writes...

THE UNEMPLOYMENT rate remains the same when local governments lay off regular employees and replace them with CETA workers.

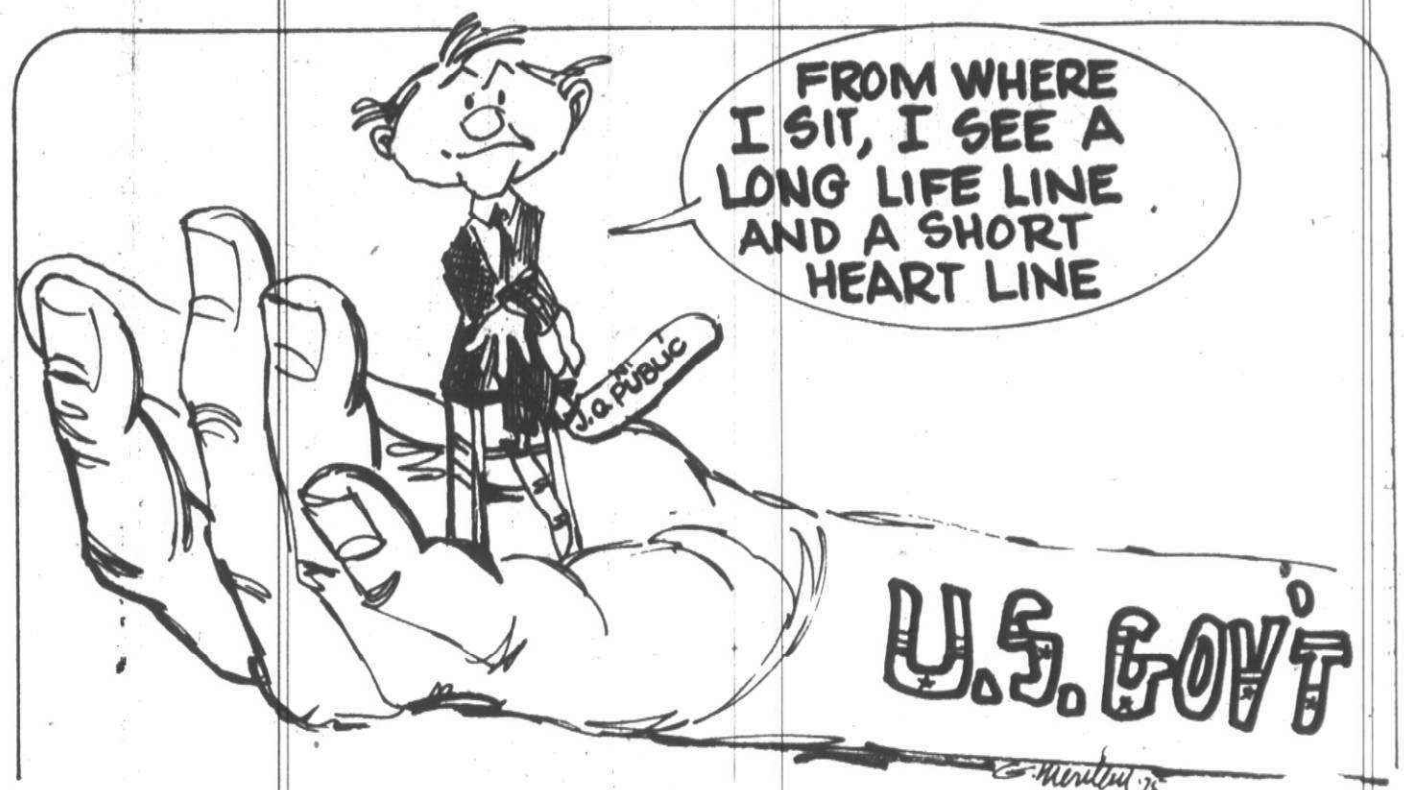
If the CETA replacement was working less than 10 years before becoming unemployed, then funds paid from state coffers for unemployment compensation increase because the regular employees with longer tenure who are laid off earned more and will collect more.

In cases where two CETA persons are used to "replace the labor" of one permanent worker, there will be a loss in discretionary income being spent on the marketplace. A CETA employee's income is likely to be limited to basic purchases most of which he made while collecting unemployment. He certainly lacks extra income for a new car, furniture, or down payment on a house.

WHAT WE GET is a trade-off in unemployment with the rate remaining the same, the possibility of an increase in unemployment compensation paid by the state and a decrease in discretionary dollars entering the economy.

This may help local budgets, but does little to help the economy as Congress expected the CETA program would. I suggest we need to attach another string—that federal funds cannot be used by local governments to perform labor already performed by someone else.

Certainly, federal dollars shouldn't be used to take jobs away from the employed under the guise of giving jobs to the unemployed.



We get what we don't need

"There is good news from Washington today. The Congress is deadlocked and can't act." — Will Rogers.

Ten, maybe three, years ago, such an old saw would have been greeted with grumps and even snarls from many people, when the bulk of the nation viewed government action as the surest and best way of solving our problems.

But today it's all different, perhaps not provable by hard data but as obvious though as impalpable as a heavy fog stealing over the landscape, leaving everything quite the same yet somehow utterly different. Quite simply, we don't trust government much anymore.

In part, it's because all levels, government has become too darn expensive for what it returns to us. In part, it's because government has become too heavy-handed (the seat-belt interlocks on the cars) to be useful, or too thick-headed (the effect of the Interstate Commerce Commission in keeping freight rates high) to be depended on.

And in part, it is because government seems increasingly to be intervening in a heavy-handed manner into the lives of ordinary citizens in order to accomplish, at great cost in taxes, things that we don't want done to us.

A few years ago, we could regard our government as an extension of us; now we regard it, in most of its forms, as "them."

THE LITANY of examples is as long as any conversation in a bar.

The State of Michigan is currently figuring out how to spend millions it doesn't have, to buy school buses which very few people want, in order to accomplish the supposed purpose of integrating the schools in Detroit but with the near-certain result of further segregating education in the metropolitan region. It is doing so because the government, under the aegis of the federal courts, is telling it to do so.

In the last decade the federal government has spent God-only-knows how many billions of dollars to stabilize the economy and help out the poor, but then that same government will not tell the catastrophe-ridden automobile industry what the emission standard will be for the next five years or what the rules of the gas mileage game are, with the net result that unemployment in our region is higher than at any point since the Great Depression.

Our government is supposed to stop malefactors of great pollution from mucking up our lakes

and streams and woods. Yet the Reserve Mining Co., by federal court order, is permitted seemingly indefinitely to keep dumping 67,000 tons of taconite tailings daily into Lake Superior. We are paying for this permission with our taxes, and then we shall pay even more in taxes to clean up the mess that Reserve Mining has made in our greatest remaining unpolluted body of fresh water.

And so on, and so on, and so on, etc.

THE ONLY PLACE where government seems to be doing a reasonably good job is on the small, local level, where people can get at it—or better yet, where it keeps its cotton-pickin' hands off what ordinary people are trying to do together.

Most millage renewals in these suburbs passed last week, and even a few increases were approved. This, I suspect, is not because the voters are enamored of paying more taxes but rather because they have a feeling that they have some say for what's going on in their local school systems with their tax money and can beef in an effective manner if they're sore.

Beyond government, even local and accessible, private citizens and businessmen are going about their lives in improving their communities.

Birmingham recently sprouted flowers throughout the downtown, not because some government unit wanted, but because some local businessmen got together and did it.

The Farmington Founders Festival later in July, Livonia's birthday celebration "Spree 25", and the Plymouth Fall Festival are other examples of worthwhile activities which people work at, and hard, because they think they're worthwhile—not because some government unit wants it.

My guess is that this kind of local, non-governmental, non-coerced, small-scale activity is where people are today. What it means for the future is two-fold: (1) A lot of the government nonsense will be got rid of; (2) A lot of politicians had better sit up and take notice...or else.

The U.S. Postal Serveless

Several years ago the United States Postal Service was created as a separate public corporation with the announced purpose of taking the mail out of politics and building a self sufficient, more efficient postal system in the United States.

We, who are in the business of substantial mailings, applauded the move because it looked as though mail would be moved quicker at a substantially lower cost to the taxpayer.

I feel like a Monday morning quarterback, but in retrospect I now question the move.

Since the United States Postal Service has come into being, postal rates have increased substantially and mail service has been reduced substantially.

THE PROBLEM IS not a local one. Letters mailed locally are handled with dispatch. Newspapers are delivered on a local basis with the same dedication and efficiency.

However, once you want to send something out of town the ground rules are changed.

In the old days you could mail letters well into the evening and still expect them to be delivered in the next town the next day. Today it is very difficult to find a place where a letter will be picked up after six o'clock in the evening; and it takes a minimum of two days for that letter to be delivered to the next town.

AN EXAMPLE OF the new systems is that a letter mailed in Birmingham, going to Troy or Bloomfield Hills, which about the city limits of Birmingham, must now travel to Royal Oak to be sorted and then sent back to those communities—and we are paying more for this service. Maybe this increased travel is one of the reasons it is more expensive.

Under the new law creating the United States Postal Service, postal rates were set by a Postal Rate Commission. The new service made a proposal in 1973 to the Postal Rate Commission and that proposal still has not been acted upon.

UNDER THE POSTAL Service Law the new service was allowed to charge temporary rates until the postal rate commission acted. It makes

a mockery of the terms to have temporary rates for two years and still not be near to having any permanent rates.

At the end of last month an administrative-law judge named Seymour Wenner, as part of the rate commission procedure, made new recommendations. He proposed that the first class rates be decreased, air mail rates be increased and, the second class rate, which covers newspapers, be increased 473% for local newspapers and over 300% for magazines, and that the parcel post be increased by 67.5%.

THE SECOND AND third class mailings of newspapers, magazines and circulars help keep the post office in business because their volume pays the basic salaries of postal employees. The average American household, according to the best market research available, sends only 3.2 first class letters in a typical week.

If Wenner's rulings were to be adopted by the postal rate commission, which I am sure they will not be, people will either be spending a lot more for newspaper and magazine subscriptions or the post office is going to lose an awful lot of business when commercial mailers turn to alternative delivery systems.

LOCAL NEWSPAPERS at least, are fortunate because they can convert to a carrier system and deliver at one ninth of the postal rate.

It was everyone's fond hope that an independent postal corporation would be able to deliver the mail more efficiently and at less cost. The facts of the matter are that neither has occurred.

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'Disturbed' boy disturbs man

Editor:

During a past 10-day period I witnessed a young lad of about 10 years of age on three separate occasions. He was behaving strangely. The events occurred in Livonia.

He appeared to be a quite happy and intelligent boy. He was by himself at each chance encounter in a fast food establishment where he ordered and ate by himself.

However, he showed signs of intensive, nervous hyperactivity and spoke very, very loudly to himself about what he was doing. He behaved in this fashion despite the very close presence of other people, all strangers, who had come very loudly.

These chance meetings occurred during school hours, and I became concerned the child might not be receiving appropriate attention for what I considered to be extreme autism, an instance of an exceptional child. He appeared to be quite intelligent.

His raggedy appearance and completely independent existence away from others of his own age deepened my concern.

I called the State Office of Social Services at 11130 a.m. and everyone was out to lunch.

I called the Child Development Office in Plymouth and was told it was shut down.

I called the Plymouth State Home and was referred to Wayne Intermediate Schools and a Beatrice Gill.

Gill was in conference and her secretary was told I would call back. I did not disclose my identity. I called back and spoke with the secretary again. I disclosed my phone number but refused to say who it was. I was told that Gill would not return the call. I suggested that Gill was having a problem herself.

Whom does one get in touch with to make sure that Gill and her secretary get their egos straightened out so that the young boy, if he is unattended, might receive proper care? My personal identity is irrelevant to the proper investigation of this situation.

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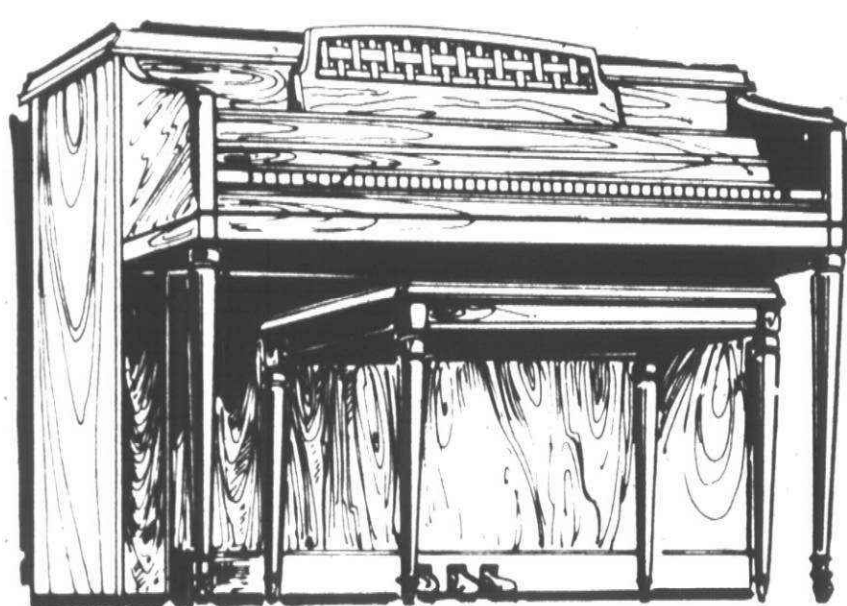
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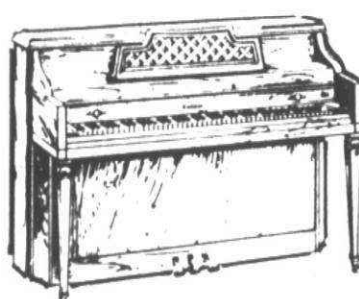
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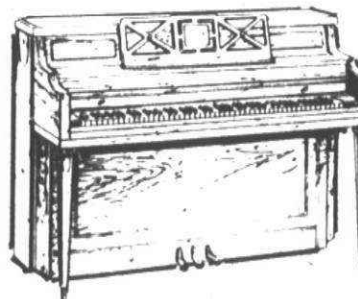
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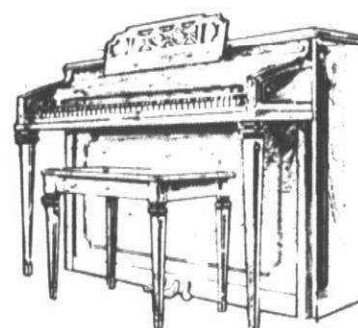
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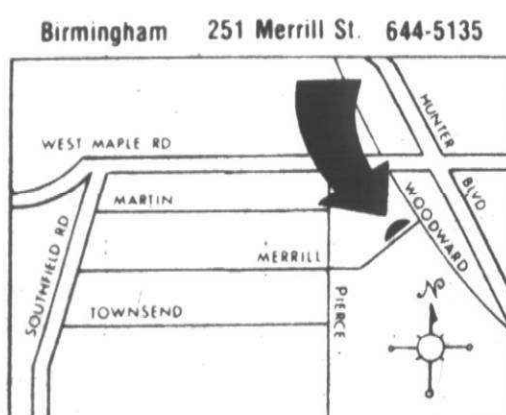
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'Computers really turn students on'

In the past, mastery of the three Rs was enough to guarantee success in the business world.

But today, when some contend there isn't a segment of the American population untouched by computers, Livonia educators are concerned with computer literacy.

As a result, the school district offers high school students four computer classes. Each high school is equipped with three terminals and an unlimited amount of computer time.

LIVONIA'S COMPUTER program was recently the topic of a Michigan State University seminar where Livonia math coordinator Dr. Charles Zoet and computer specialist Larry Smith explained the program.

"We feel that everyone should have some experience with computers," Smith said.

"What we begin teaching is a kind of computer literacy—what computers are, what they are capable of doing and what their limitations are.

"You always see the cartoons showing what the computers did to people. But, the first mistake was made by a person. The computer did exactly what it was told to do."

ANOTHER MYTH that computer classes dispel is that only a genius can operate a computer.

Smith has recently been introducing some computer lessons to fourth, fifth and sixth graders.

"If you ask a child what a computer can do, the child will tell you it can answer any question," Smith said.

"So I tell them to go ahead and ask the computer anything. When they do the computer usually responds with question marks and the children then switch their beliefs and think the computer is dumb.

"We then show the children that the computer can only answer questions that it is programmed to answer."

According to Zoet, learning to use a computer is a practical skill.

"We know there are people who work in math who are going to do a lot of problem solving by computer," Zoet said. "There are interesting and special methods of problem solving that can be done only by a computer. Students ought to have enough exposure to computers to know what they can do."

ZOET MAINTAINS that computers serve as a strong motivational learning tool.

"The students operate them all the time. You seldom see students fighting to get into the library. But the computer really turns them on."

In addition to school hours, computer time is available at Franklin High School from 6 to 10 p.m. week nights. Smith knows of students who rent their own terminals for home use and another student who has built a terminal from a kit for \$300.

He estimates that the district could use six terminals at each high school and two at each junior high, but the district cannot afford the cost.

IF THERE IS a drawback in the use of computers, Zoet feels it is that some students are turned off by the computer's demand for preciseness.

"Students often have to debug their programs," he said. "We've been brought up in math to believe that if you do things right, you're going to get a right answer."

"But it doesn't work with programs if you so much as leave out a comma. Computer classes teach a person to think critically."

ALTHOUGH the computer classes are taught as part of the math and business departments, computer use is beginning to drift into other subject areas.

Zoet noted that on a limited basis, social studies classes were using the computers to simulate such social data as management of community facilities.

Although Smith stressed that he is not an advocate of replacing geometry with computers, some believe that since geometry tries to teach a deduc-

Wayne County Commissioner Royce E. Smith has reissued a plea for public support of proposed legislation authorizing a 1975 census.

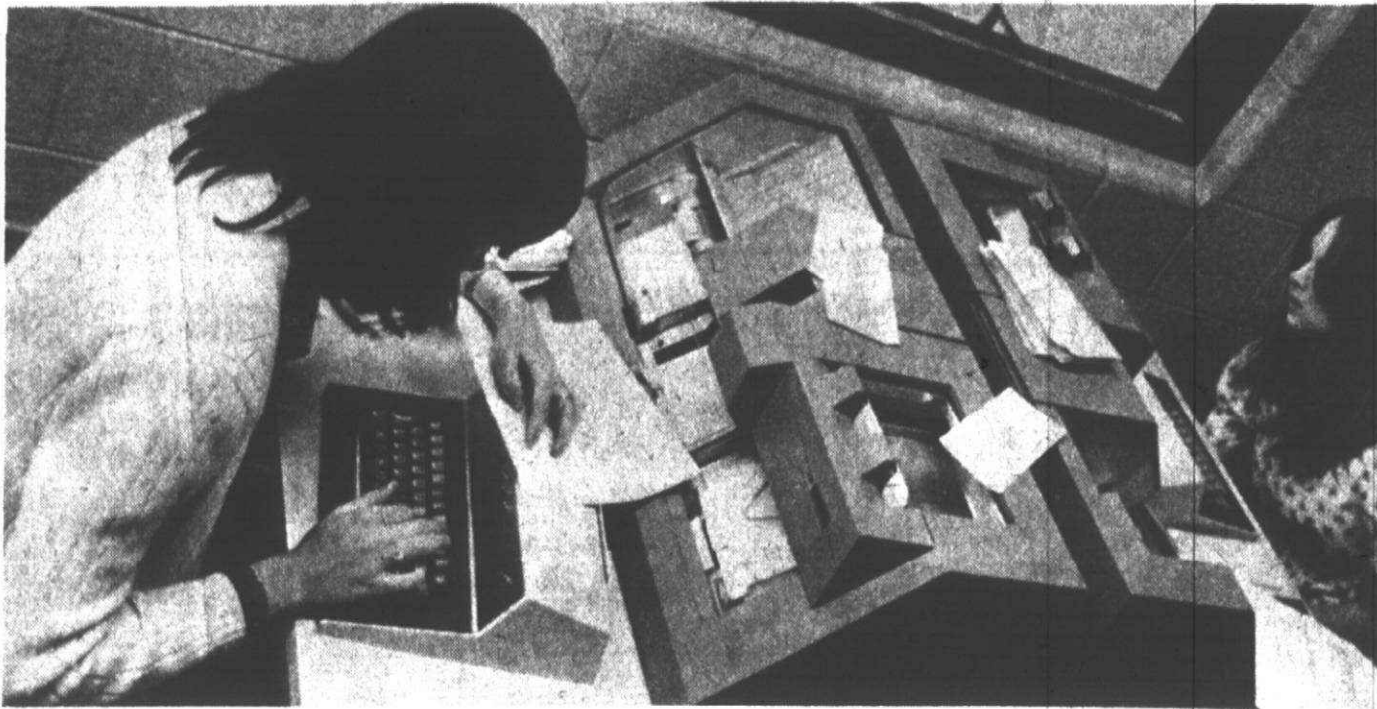
The bill would put many suburbs west of Detroit in line for substantial increases in state aid due to population growth since the 1970 federal census, Smith maintained.

His 27th district includes Plymouth, Canton Township, and part of Westland.

"Because local communities receive state funds on a population basis, this legislation would almost guarantee major increases for cities and townships in western Wayne County," Smith said.

"All of western Wayne County has gained substantially in population."

Canton Township, he estimated, has probably two and a half times the population it had in 1970. He also figured the rest of western Wayne County may have doubled its population.

tive, logical process of problem solving, a computer class might eventually replace geometry just as Latin has vanished from the schools as a language base.

LEARNING to use a computer has

another practical advantage—as a career opportunity.

Several members of a computer math course at Stevenson High mentioned computer programming as a possible college major.

"I liked math, so I took the com-

puter classes as just another math class. It gives you the chance to think," Pam Sutton said.

"My dad used to work with them, and he told me a lot about them. I'm thinking of going into that field when I go to college."

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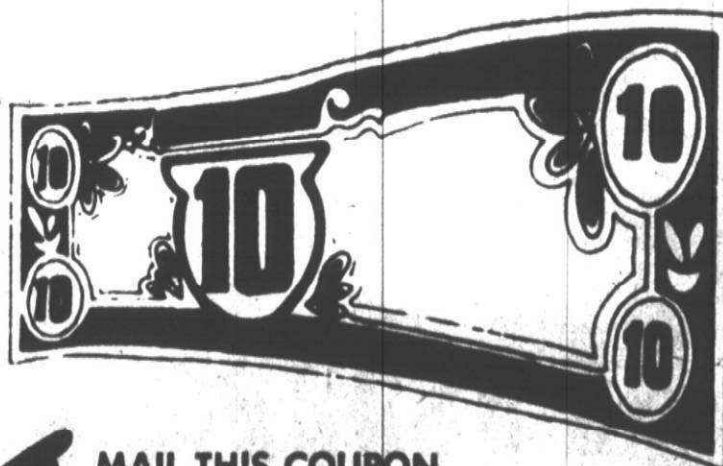

The team includes many athletes who were standouts in more than one event and many who challenged in last month's state championship.

An example of one such athlete is Livonia Churchill's Bill Reardon who was voted track and field athlete of the year by area coaches.

Reardon was virtually unbeatable in the shot put early in the year, taking such events as the tri-state Mansfield Relays and the state's biggest pre-season event, the Spartan Relays.

Reardon had a peak toss of 56 feet six inches, won the regional and finished third in the state in Class A competition.

High jumper Darrell Korzym was the team point leader for Thurston and the Panthers' MVP. Korzym hit a high of 6-4 in the high jump for a school record. Twice in dual meet competition Korzym won four events and twice the versatile senior won three events.

Long jump first team selection Paul Lokar was Livonia Stevenson's most versatile trackman. Lokar finished seventh in the state in his event and had a season high of 21 feet, 11 and one-half inches.

Rick Powers combined with Reardon to give Churchill the most feared field event duo in the area. Along with second team selection Paul Schultz, Powers made the vault a Charger plus at every meet. Powers had a season best of 14 feet, six and one-half inches in his event.

When it came to pure speed, there was no one in the area who could top Franklin's Dan Quinn. Quinn, who took first team honors in the 100 yard dash, also competed on Franklin's area best 440 and 880 yard relay teams.

Rich Hammill of Livonia Bentley was the only junior to make the first team. Hammill ran an area best of 22.4 in the event and showed his consistency by going the distance in under 22.6 a full six times this year.

Tom Jakubowski of Westland John Glenn was the last word in the hurdle events this year.

The fleet senior was clocked in 14.2 in the 120 yard high hurdles, a full

half second better than anyone else in the area.

The first team low hurdler was Redford Union's Joe Austin. Austin came on late in the year to drive his best time in the event down to 20 seconds for the predominantly senior RU squad.

When it came to distance running, no team in the area could hold a candle to Garden City East.

Doug Sweazey was easily the area's best miler, with a season's best time of 4:16.6 which he recorded in the state championship meet for a fifth place at the classic distance.

Sweazey's Panther teammate, Art

Kitze, took first place honors in the two mile event. Along with Sweazey, he was the only two miler in the area to break the nine minute, 30 second barrier at the distance.

Versatile Mark DeMeritt was the runner-up for track and field athlete of the year while competing for Plymouth Salem.

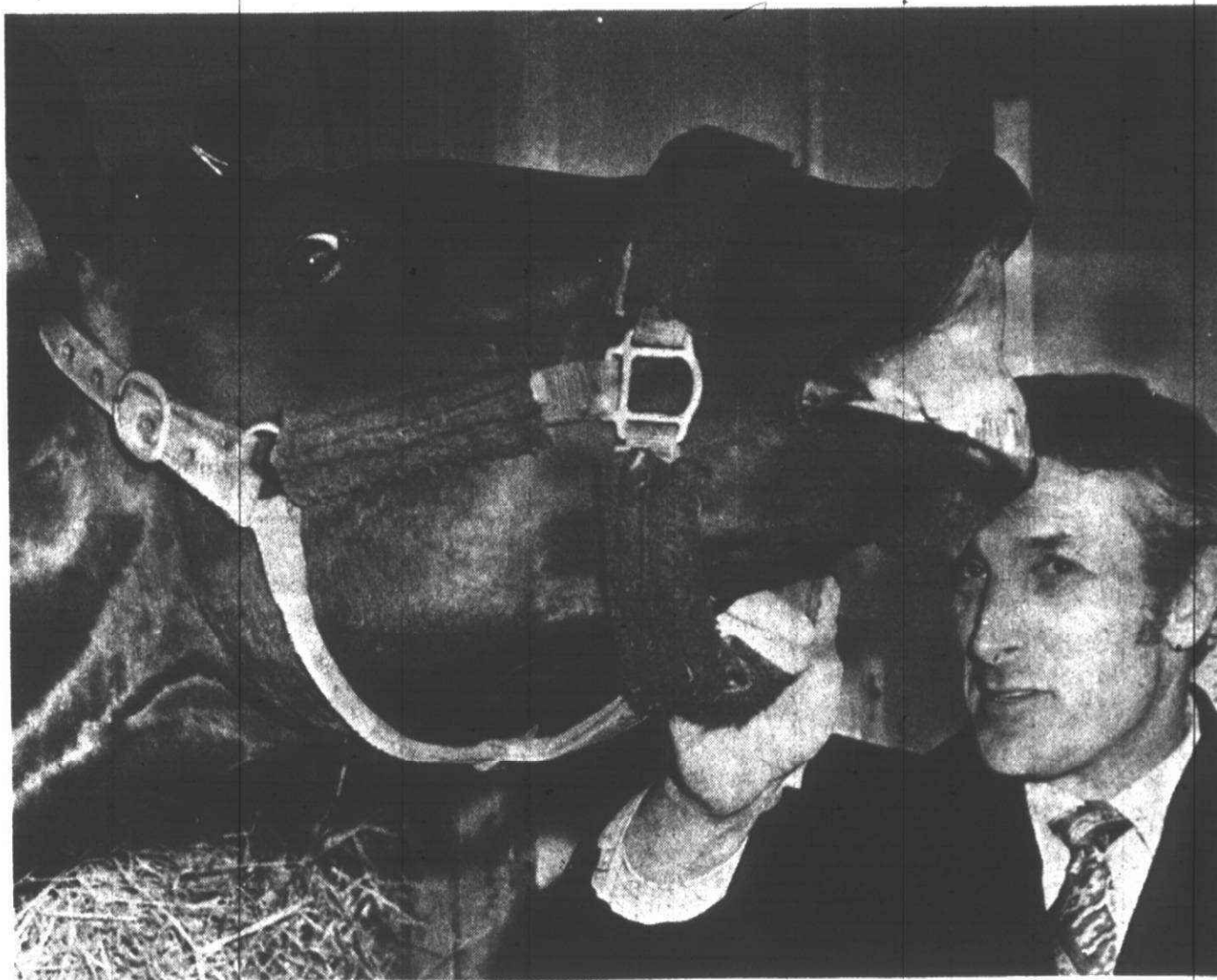
DeMeritt's best race was at 440 yards where he recorded an area best of 49 seconds at the state meet, but he could also fly at 220 yards with a 22.4 clocking.

Stevenson's Ken Brown was the standout half-miler in the area and a repeat performer from last year's

team. Brown smashed the two-minute barrier in the event seven of the 10 times in which he competed at the distance this season, won the regional and finished third at the state finals with a time of 1:53.5.

Livonia Franklin took honors in two of three relay events with five runners, Dan Quinn, Dave Smith, Jim Casey, Phil Yuhasz and Greg McGuire alternating to post season's bests of 43.7 in the 440 relay and 1:29.7 in the 880 yard relay.

The area mile relay champion was Redford Union with Jim Lalonde, Ron Pawlak, Doug Milne and Mike Hasty combining for a best of 3:24.3.

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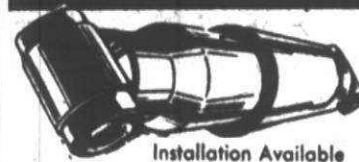


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Classic Mile set Saturday at DRC

Despite the arrival of Stonewalk and Navajo on the grounds early this week, between 10 and 12 thoroughbreds are expected to answer the bugle call for the 27th annual \$100,000 Michigan Mile and One Eighth at Detroit Race Course Saturday.

Stonewalk, who will be ridden by famed Secretariat jockey Ron Turcott, reported to DRC Tuesday still steaming from his impressive upset victory in the \$100,000 Massachusetts

Handicap at Boston Sunday. Navajo, a handsome gray who will be high-weighted at 121 pounds in the Mile, arrived Monday showing a 1975 record of seven victories and \$115,290 in nine starts.

"They haven't scared off many others," DRC racing secretary Tom Dorsey confirmed. "Even Golden Don, who has raced only once this year, is shipping in for his third straight Mile."

Winner of the 1973 Michigan classic but a disappointing sixth place finisher last year, Golden Don will try what many other horses have attempted and failed. No horse has ever won Michigan's richest horse race twice. The big son of T.V. Lark started for the first and only time this year on June 13 at Belmont Park and won the \$20,000 event handily at a mile and one sixteenth.

THE IMPORTANT DRAW for post positions will be held at DRC Thursday morning during the annual Michigan Mile Brunch, and horsemen will be carefully watching the race placement of such other expected starters as Zografos, Crimson Falcon, Hey Rube, Mr. Lucky Phoenix, Rastafarian, Ace Commander and Pro-vante.

The 7-year-old Zografos, bred in Argentina and owned by the illustrious Hasty House Farm, has won his last three in a row including the \$57,530

National Jockey Club Handicap at Sportsman's Park in Chicago. In a nostalgic twist, Zografos is trained by the veteran Harry Trotsek who saddled Sir Sprite back in 1949 and sent him out to win the very first Michigan Mile.

Speaking of nostalgia, there is also a fair share surrounding another top Mile challenger, Crimson Falcon. The big Crimson King Farm entry is a 5-year-old son of DRC's almost legendary Crimson Satan, who not only won the 1963 Mile but in the process established a track record which still stands, 1:40.3 over a mile and a sixteenth.

Crimson Satan was unanimously named "DRC's Silver Anniversary Horse" two years ago and Crimson Falcon is now in his second year of trying to emulate his famous father in Detroit. Last June he finished fourth in the Mile and this year he has tuned up even more impressively by winning his only two starts at DRC, the

\$15,000 Armed Forces Day Handicap on May 17 and the \$15,000 Michigan Mile Trial last Saturday.

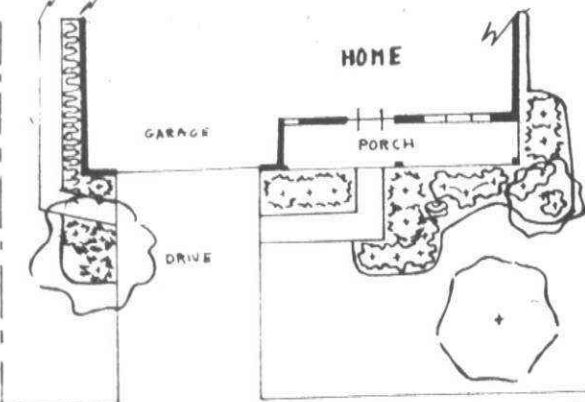
Another popular Detroit-area thoroughbred is waiting for not only his first stab at the classic but also the chance to become the first Michigan-bred horse ever to win the DRC headliner. He is Ace Commander, winner on June 7 of his second straight Frontier Handicap at the Livonia mile track and the valuable 6-year-old property of Mrs. Margaret David of South Lyon.

ACE COMMANDER HAS ALREADY won nearly \$45,000 this year under the riding skill of Hawaiian jockey Larry Kunitake, and his spectacular come-from-behind victory in the recent \$51,600 Frontier guaranteed him a start in the Mile with trainer Pat Milligan.

Next Sunday's league championship game will be played at Cass Lake against Utica Susa.

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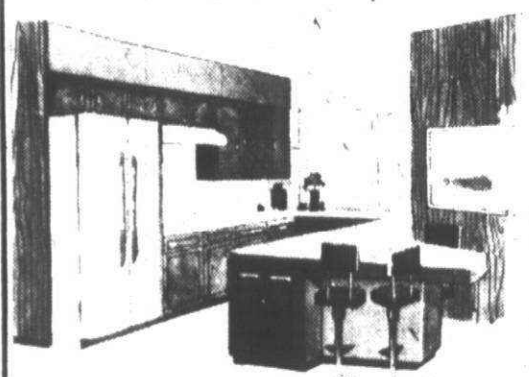

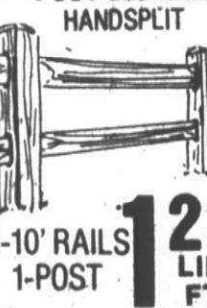

A succession of police chiefs

(Part II)

Recurring references to vagrants appear in reports of the Plymouth police department written in the 1920s and '30s.

In 1929, some 182 cases of vagrancy were listed. The 1930 report indicated there were "201 applicants for lodging in the village jail." By 1932-33, perhaps the worst of the depression years, 509 "lodgers" were cared for. By 1941-42, when America was at war, the number of lodgers had dropped to 130.

A year or two before the United States became involved in World War II, there was much concern in the nation about possible sabotage and potential "fifth column" activities. In his 1939-40 report, Chief Vaughan Smith warned the residents of Plymouth not to over-react by taking the law into their own hands.

"In the wave of patriotism that is rising in the country there lies the danger of over-zealous groups of individuals engaging in acts which are distinctly un-American in method," he wrote.

"No matter how patriotic in aim, we need no vigilantes in this situation. Your local police department has been trained to investigate all matters relating to espionage, sabotage and fifth column activities and will welcome any information relative to any case."

THE NATION'S World War II effort created a variety of problems for the local police department.

One of them was an increase in crime by juveniles. In his 1942-44 report, Charles J. Thumme, who succeeded Smith as chief in 1941, attributed the upward trend in juvenile delinquency to unrest caused by the war.

A sharp increase in traffic through Plymouth was another problem. Commenting on the congestion caused during certain hours by commuters driving to and from the Willow Run bomber plant, Thumme recommended that traffic to that plant from the north of the City of Plymouth be rerouted on Mill Street to Ann Arbor Road.

During the war years, 65 Plymouth City auxiliary police officers and 25 Plymouth Township auxiliary police officers were trained in police work, including traffic control, police patrol work, crime investigation, first aid, gases and bombs.

In his statistical summary for 1942-43, Thumme noted, 341 government investigations were conducted locally, presumably in connection with the war effort.

In 1929, the police department con-

sisted of a chief, two fulltime uniformed men, three part-time men and six reserve men. The city budget showed salaries and wages for the entire department totalled \$8,000.

In 1931-32, when Vaughan Smith took over from George Springer, the department's personnel was reduced and the hours of work increased. In 1935-36, however, Smith found it necessary to add four men to the staff. The trend, following population growth, has been upward since that time. Today there are 20 men plus five civilian desk people on the staff, including the chief, and the total yearly payroll is \$384,000.

LEE SACKETT followed Thumme as chief of police in 1944. Sackett figured in the recall controversy covered in another article.

He was succeeded in 1950 by Carl R. Greenlee who served until 1954. Kenneth Fisher, chief from 1954 through 1960, was Director of Public Safety from 1960 to 1965 and had charge of the police, fire and building departments. In 1965, when George Schoenneman, became fire chief, Fisher was named police chief again. 21eso3402p Since Fisher resigned in 1967, the police chiefs in the City of Plymouth have been Robert Corrington, Herbert Straley, and the present holder of the office, Timothy C. Ford.

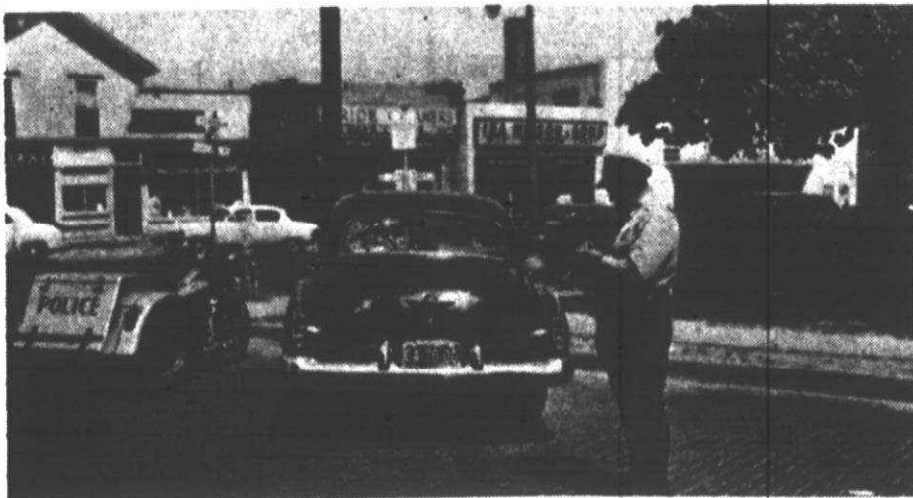
During the time Straley was chief, there was controversy over the propriety of the police department's use of juveniles as agents in reporting on the use of narcotics by students in local schools. Straley's administration also ran into some flack when it tried to clamp down on an underground newspaper.

FORD JOINED the department as chief of police in 1971, several months after Straley resigned to take a position in the East.

Before coming to Plymouth, Ford served six years as director of public safety of the City of Gibraltar, where he was in charge of police and fire departments.

Chief Ford holds a degree in law from Blackstone College, and a BS in police administration from Wayne State University. He is now serving his third term in office as president of the Wayne County Police Chiefs Association. For the past six years, he has taught law enforcement classes at Schoolcraft and Henry Ford community colleges.

Ford emphasizes human relations in police performance. He believes people, not crime, are a policeman's first concern. He says the idea that the policeman is primarily an enforcer is outmoded. The modern police department renders a diversity of services to the community, he points out, including the training of school crossing guards. "Police spend less



and less time chasing bad guys," Ford says, "and more time assisting people."

The City of Plymouth's police force today consists of a chief, an assistant chief (Loren Johnson, who has been on the force since 1942, and has been second in command since 1959), two lieutenants, two sergeants, and other officers, making a total of 20 fulltime persons.

Specialists include a chief of detectives, a youth sergeant and a community service officer. The latter, who is specially trained to work with young

people, was added to the force in 1971 under a grant from the federal government.

As to the future, Chief Ford believes the impending opening of the Jeffries and the I-275 freeways, just east and north of the city, will make less, rather than more traffic through the community. Because slums aren't being created here, he doesn't believe Plymouth will ever see any upsurge in crime. He does, however, see the need for expansion of police services as the city's commercial area expands.

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Meeting set Monday

Help on way for parents wanting to adopt

Two township residents are enrolling Michigan in a national organization designed to help orphans and the parents who long to adopt them.

Alan and Judy Prince, 6745 Foxthorn, are trying to fight Michigan's slow-moving adoption procedure and the red-tape barriers that block the adoption of children across state lines.

THE PRINCES hope their goals can be realized by establishing a Michigan

chapter of Aid to the Adoption of Special Kids (AASK), a California-based organization which acts as a liaison between adoption agencies and parents seeking adoptive children.

The couple hopes to organize the new AASK chapter Monday, June 23, when they hold a first AASK meeting in their home at 7:30 p.m.

"Our main thing is to get the Michigan agencies to know we're here, so they can register with us," Mrs. Prince explained. "AASK is trying to

fight for a new federal adoption law, and we want to start fund-raising activities to help them."

A nationwide adoption law would speed up the adoption process, Mrs. Prince maintains.

"We want to make it just as easy to go into New York for a child as it is to go into Washtenaw County."

THE PRINCES began waging their battle against the slow-moving adoption process late last winter, months

after their home study was completed.

Angered by newspaper accounts of 1,200 state orphans awaiting adoption, Mrs. Prince complained about the state's adoption process in letters to Gov. Milliken and the Michigan Department of Social Services (DSS).

The couple, parents of natural five and seven year-old sons, were interested in children traditionally regarded as hard to place—those up to

10-years-old with mental, physical or emotional handicaps.

The Prince family welcomed a nine-year-old Vietnamese orphan as a new family addition in May but still wonder where the 1,200 state orphans could be.

"If there are 1,200 children available, why can't they match them up with the parents who want them?" asked Mrs. Prince, who wants to add more adoptive children to her family. "It shouldn't take more than a month after a home study is completed to

place a child. There seems to be a breakdown somewhere."

Mrs. Prince hopes to list all the orphans in Michigan agencies on an AASK's master list. Couples could then seek adoptive children in numerous counties and states.

Michigan's adoption program is now largely run by individual counties. Vicki Rector, program manager for adoption at DSS, pins part of the fault for the state's slow-moving adoption process on county adoption workers, who fail to examine adoption lists of other places.

Canton can join '911' emergency program

PLYMOUTH—The entire Plymouth area could be served by the "911" emergency telephone system within 15 months if Plymouth and Canton townships agree to participate.

The Plymouth City Commission voted 4-1 Monday night to initiate the emergency system and invite neighboring communities to join.

Commissioner Robert Sincok was the dissenting vote because he felt the townships should be contacted first before the city committed itself, and because he had concerns about additional manpower requirements and the willingness of the other municipalities to share that expense.

Other commissioners felt the sys-

tem was beneficial to residents and the city should implement the program even if others didn't join. Commissioners John Moehle and Norbert Battermann were absent.

UNDER THE system, residents faced with an emergency dial the numerals nine-one-one and are immediately connected with a central dispatcher in the Plymouth Police Department.

The dispatcher records the information; a police car, fire truck or ambulance is sent to the place of emergency. Before the vehicle is sent out, however, an automatic call-back feature returns the call to make sure it is an

actual emergency and not a crank call.

A number of cities have already implemented the 911 program, and Michigan Bell hopes it will become nationwide within a few years. A big advantage of the system is that it is easier for residents to remember the numbers 911, which then can be dialed in an instant. Often it is hard to remember the numbers for the fire department and police department.

In fact, at Monday's commission meeting members of the audience were asked to recite the police department phone number. Almost all of the few present recited the weekend num-

ber, which isn't the number used on weekdays.

AS ESTABLISHED by Michigan Bell, explains Mayor Beverly McAninch, when a number of municipalities share the same phone exchange one community must agree to initiate the program before it can get off the ground.

The phone company asked the City of Plymouth to take the initiative and has agreed to approach Plymouth, Canton and Northville townships and the City of Westland. The city will also contact each unit to ask cooperation in the project.

Westland is already considering implementing 911 and has budgeted some \$1,400 for that purpose. The City of Wayne has started 911 which now serves the "Parkway" exchange which covers part of Canton Township.

The present cost to the city involves hooking up some lines into the police central desk dispatch and installing the callback feature. If other communities join, other dispatchers would have to be employed with their salaries shared by the 911 participants.

The quicker service possible because the 911 has its separate circuit and is not affected by calls on the

regular Plymouth phone exchanges.

After Sincok suggested waiting until the townships agreed, Mayor McAninch responded that the only way 911 can be set up is for one community to initiate the system and then approach others to join.

It will take 15 months after Monday's approval to install the system, added City Manager Fred Yockey. That will allow ample time for discussions with Plymouth, Canton and Northville townships.

Members of the audience expressed concern about problems Detroit has had with 911. Yockey responded: "This is Plymouth, not Detroit."

SOME YEARS AGO one of the chief breeding grounds for potential football stars was the coal regions of eastern and central Pennsylvania. Many a young lad whose father "slaved" in the dark tunnels under the earth's surface to keep the family larder filled, received his education because he could play football.

One of the most famous cases concerns the importing of an entire college team that played together under the school's colors for four years.

Seated at his sports desk at the hometown newspaper The Stroller received a telephone call inviting him to meet the new Muhlenberg College coach the next afternoon.

At the appointed time he reached the athletic director's office, but there was no new coach in sight. Finally, the door opened, and in walked a short, stocky, freckle-faced fellow, who announced that he was Tom Kelly, the new coach. It was a rather strange way to take over a new position.

After shaking hands all around Tom looked at the list of returning lettermen posted on the wall and noticing

names such as Laudenschlager, Hefelfinger, Nonnemacher, Schultz, Klebschelde and Schantz, he turned to the athletic director and asked: "Haven't you got any 'mics' here?"

"By any chance would you mean Catholics?" the director asked and shaking his head said, "This a heavily endowed Lutheran school."

"WELL, THERE'LL BE some here on Monday," the new coach countered. And there were. The following Monday 15 "students" arrived from the coal regions. They signed up for the easiest courses, they seldom attended classes, but they did play football and gave the school its first winning season in years.

Another well remembered case concerned a good young high school athlete who was born and raised in the shadows of the Bethlehem Steel works.

The young lad, "Bots" Brunner, enrolled at Lehigh University as a freshman and played on the varsity in his first year. He was at the University of Pennsylvania for his sophomore year, played his junior year at Yale University, and finished at Lafayette, Lehigh's major rival, in his senior year.

In the big game that year, when an underdog Lehigh team played Lafayette on even terms until the closing minutes, "Bots" dropped back to attempt a field goal. But even as the ball sailed over the cross bar to win the game, the Lafayette students booed. It wasn't their way of playing up to the code.

As a youth The Stroller was caught in one of these cases at the high school level.

A group of young lads who, because of economic reasons, were forced to leave school early, formed an independent football team known as the Majestics.

ENCOUNTERING DIFFICULTY in scheduling games, the principal of North Catasauqua high school that never before had engaged in athletics, suggested that we play under the school banner.

The mere fact that we had large Ms on our jerseys didn't stop us. We became Mc Kinley High School.

Our first game under the school banner was scheduled in the little town of Leighton. The school principal went with us. And he was in high glee as we ran up a safe margin to assure victory.

As we were doing that the students on the Leighton team looked at our rough hands and hollered across the line, "you're funny looking students with hands like those."

There was growing evidence that we might get caught and caused a real rumpus until one of the Leighton linemen, a tackle, was injured. As he was taken from the playing field, one of the Leighton boys couldn't help smiling, as he said, "There goes our history teacher."

Imagine that! And now the colleges have become alarmed over the use of a credit card.

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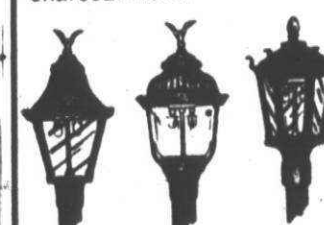
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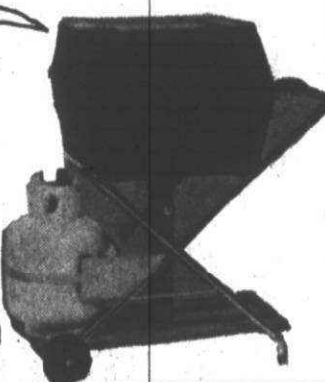
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Girls get into picture in student home-building

They may have "made every mistake you can", but along the way they've learned a lot about draperies—perhaps for future use in their own homes.

And the girls who have just completed the commercial sewing class at Bentley High School also furnished an important addition to the student-built house at 17982 Floral that is just about ready to go on the market.

So did the young women in a home furnishings class, who had the fun of picking harmonizing paint, paper, tile and linoleum and also the frustration of late deliveries and mismatched rolls of wallpaper.

IT WAS THE FIRST involvement for those two classes in the Livonia School District's home construction program that has completed its second marketable family home.

The home built by last year's class was sold just recently, said Arlie Fairman, coordinator of vocational education, and he's hoping a buyer for this one may show up when the public comes to visit Saturday and Sunday, June 21 and 22, to see what the students have accomplished.

Quite a few of the students involved—both the boys pounding in nails to put finishing touches on exteriors and the girls stitching the last of the draperies—have worked beyond the call of classroom schedules to get the work closer to completion by open house time.

"It was graduation day, and there they were still sewing," said Mrs. Alice Faustman, who teaches the girls to use the big machines.

"I don't think they'll be making many draperies right away. But when they are ready to furnish their homes, they will know how to go about it."

"I think it's even good that they've had problems—they'll be less frustrated by difficulties that come up later."

FOR THE DECORATORS in Patricia Arent's home furnishings class, the experiences and frustrations also ran parallel to those of the new home-builder.

"We picked the colors throughout the house and went on many trips to get prices and coordinate colors and materials," Mrs. Arent said.

This teacher found one of her biggest jobs was to restrain great creativity on the part of her students.

Not that she didn't approve some of their individualistic ideas in the matter of decorating, but she convinced the girls that ideas with more universal appeal might be in order in a home going on the market.

"But we went wild in doing the bathroom," one of the students reported. That attractively-wild room has striped wallpaper and geometrically designed tile, all in the same shades of brown, black and white.

THE HOME BUILDING also has been a learning experience for faculty, Fairman pointed out. The first house, on Adams Street, got a late start because the program was in the formation stages, and then plans to build a second near Franklin High School fell through because the property became unavailable.

There were a number of legal maneuverings before the work on Floral could begin, he said, and when the students finally got started they built the garage first so they could have a storage place that would be locked and a working place out of the weather.

Raising the roof was a chilling proposition, Fairman added—"in the coldest weather we had the guys up on the roof pounding in nails."

The district now has sites ready for its next three houses, he said. They will be built on a rezoned piece of property in the subdivision near the Pierson school.

THE HOME-BUILDING program has been an all-district one since its inception, involving all four high schools, Fairman said.

The first year the only feminine participation involved a Churchill High family life class, which made suggestions for wall colors in the six rooms.

"But in such a small house they weren't practical, and there wasn't time to go back to the class and explain why," Fairman said. "This time the girls in the classes involved really planned all the color schemes."

The second home was built from architectural plans drawn up by the drafting class at Franklin.

"They worked from a previously-picked plan," Fairman said, adding that Livonia architect Bill Lindhout had served as a consultant.

OTHER ADVICE in the project came from community business people Charles Allen Jr., real estate; Charla Wattleworth, banking; Ed Orr, build-

ing and Pat Duggan, real estate. "And we should add a thank-you to the Michigan National Bank, which gave us a \$30,000 interest-free loan," Fairman said.

The first house sale covered construction costs and "left a little over to start the next project," he added. "That's what we hope to do this time;

we're not after any profit."

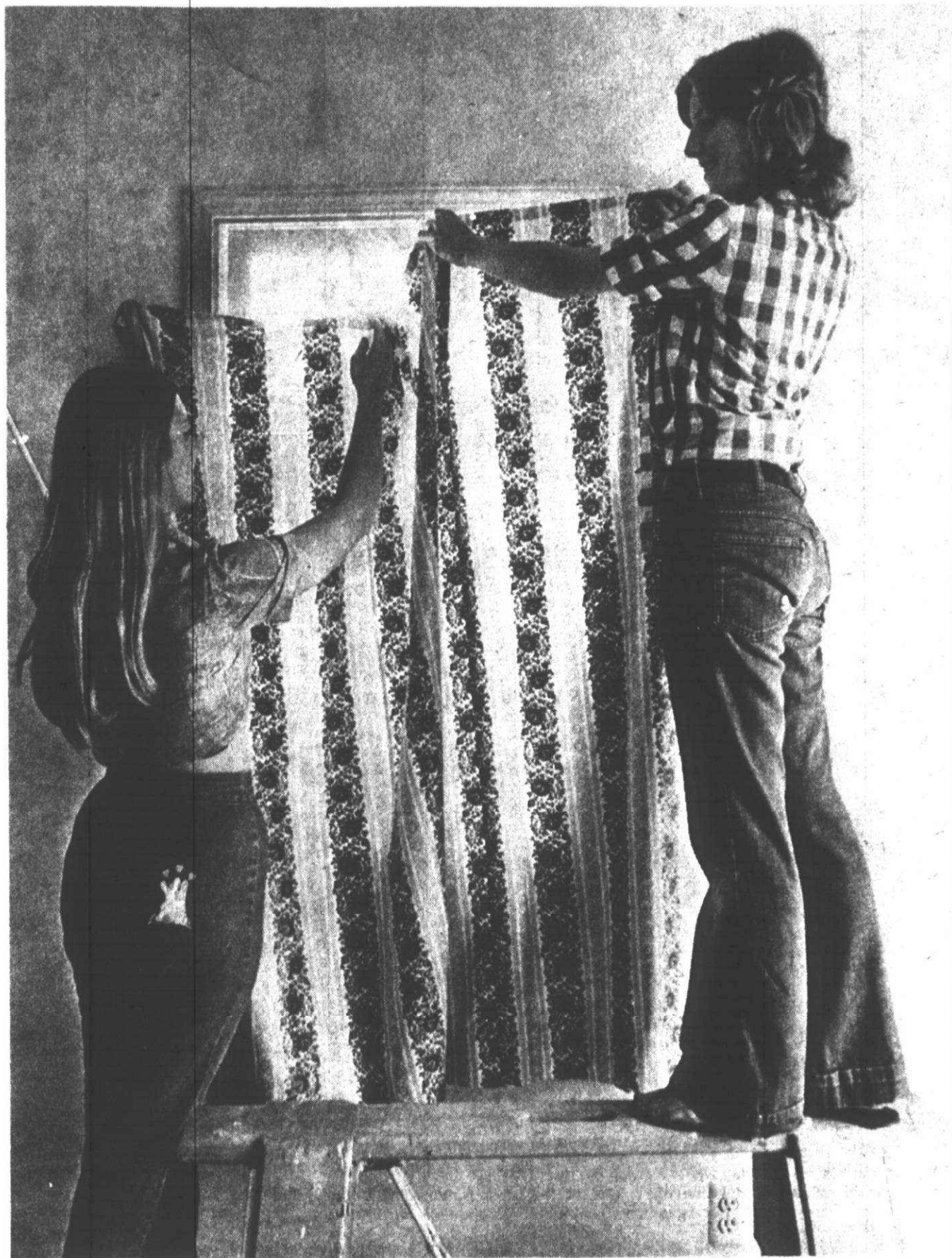
The problem of rising costs has, predictably, hit this project.

"We found costs doubled in building the second house, although the size went up only from 1,000 to 1,280 square feet," Fairman said.

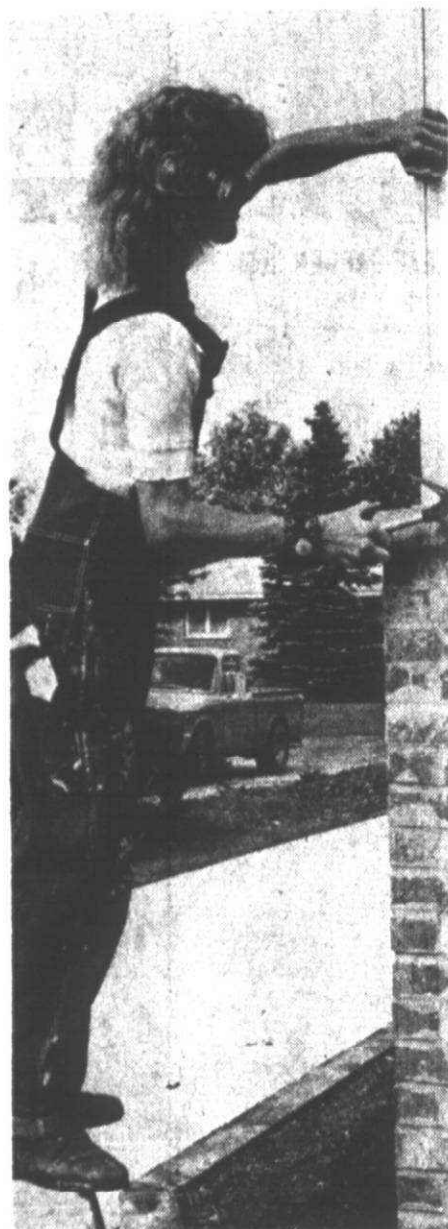
"It means we may have to do as the builders do—go to a stripped-

down, no frills model. In this house we have built-in appliances, extra insulation and accommodation for air-conditioning, but that may turn out to be too costly the next time around."

And in that respect, too, the students may be gaining a lesson useful when they become home-owners and occupiers.

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Family Y camping programs are varied

Summer camp fun, as it's being served up by the Livonia Family Y, has a big assortment of portions that vary with the age and needs of would-be campers.

Registrations are being accepted now for pre-schoolers would like to attend Kiddie Kamp at the Family Y headquarters at 14255 Stark or for their older brothers and sisters who might enjoy Fun Camp, also at the local Y, or Far Oaks Day Camp, which involves daily trips to Camp Ohiesya near Holly.

It's possible to register here too for a session at Camp Nissokone, a resident camp near Oscoda.

For all the camping possibilities, space is limited, so parents of prospective campers are urged to call as soon as possible. Family Y staff members Linda Grandstaff, Bob Willard, Nancy Richardson and Delphine LaForge can give additional information.

Weekly sessions for all the camp programs begin June 30 to Aug. 18.

KIDDIE KAMP, for children four and five years of age, is divided into six five-day sessions and designed especially as a preparation for kindergarten.

Sessions each day run from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, and each week's activities include water fun, gym time, including trampoline, arts and crafts, music, nature lore and a bus trip.

Scheduled for the last day of each session is a parent open house, when mothers and fathers are invited to participate in the program with their children.

Staff members, including a director, mother assistant and high school youth, will involve the youngsters daily in school-preparation activities like decision-making, physical and group activities, listening, interpreting and following directions.

SPECIAL WEEKLY themes will feature the Fun Camp program, designed for children from six to eight years of age. Each day's session is 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., with the children bringing sack lunches, and the cost is \$28 for members and \$33 for non-members.

The first session, with an Olympics theme, will begin Friday, June 27 and will run through Thursday, July 3. Trips will be to Kensington park for swimming and to the Detroit science center, a fire station and the Nankin Mills nature center.

The final day will be a mock Olympics contest, complete with ribbons.

PIONEER DAYS will be the theme of the session from July 7 to 14, with a visit to the Ann Arbor Museum of National History one of the main events.

Other sessions will be July 14 to 18, with an Indian Day, July 21 to 25, Christmas in July; July 28 to Aug. 1, including a Carnival Day; Aug. 4 to Aug. 8, Winnie the Pooh Day; Aug. 11 to 19, Birthdays, 1975, and Aug. 18 to 22, summer fair.

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Board Freedom Train bus at Wonderland Center

The American Freedom Train, a 25-car mobile display of this nation's 200-year history, pulls into Detroit in mid-June on its cross-country journey for the United States' bicentennial observance.

Painted in the traditional red, white and blue colors, the train will be in the Penn Central Station, 17th and Vernor in Detroit for 16 days starting

June 21. It will leave then for its two other Michigan stops, Grand Rapids on July 11 and Kalamazoo July 14 - before rolling westward across the country.

Pulled by a giant steam engine, itself a refurbished relic of the railroad past, the train is a showcase containing historical documents and artifacts ranging from Revolutionary War mus-

kets and the original Louisiana Purchase Agreement to Martin Luther King's vestment robe and Bible. The display includes rocks brought back from the moon by U.S. astronauts.

Michigan contributions range from a 1904 Oldsmobile to a pair of Joe Louis' boxing gloves.

The train is sponsored by four major corporations—General Motors, Prudential Insurance, Kraft Foods and Pepsi, each of which contributed \$1 million to get the project on the track.

Twelve of the 25 cars house displays

and exhibits, 10 of them viewable on a moving walkway inside the train, and the two other glass enclosed.

Each visitor will use a transistorized sound unit to provide a running narration coordinated with the exhibit.

Tickets are \$2 for adults, \$1 for youths 18 and under, and senior citizens 65 and older. Tickets are available at all Hudson's stores, the Fisher Theater and Cobo Hall.

American Freedom Train visitors can use a special Department of Transportation (DOT) park-and-ride

service from Wonderland Shopping Center, which will take them to and from Freedom Train site. There is limited parking space near the train site.

DOT flyers will leave Wonderland every hour on the half hour from 9:30

a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Flyers will leave the Freedom Train site every hour on the hour from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. Fare is 50 cents each way. Parking at Wonderland is free.

The DOT flyer will board at Wonderland at Gate 6.

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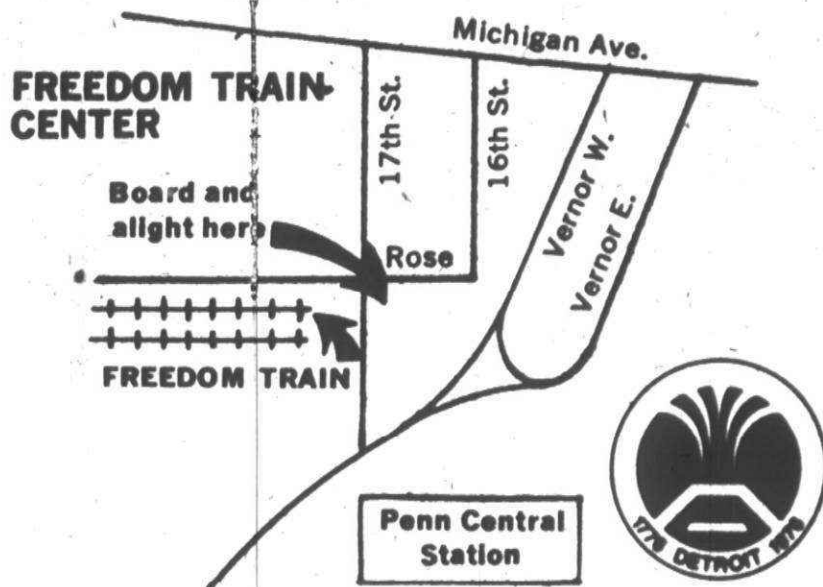
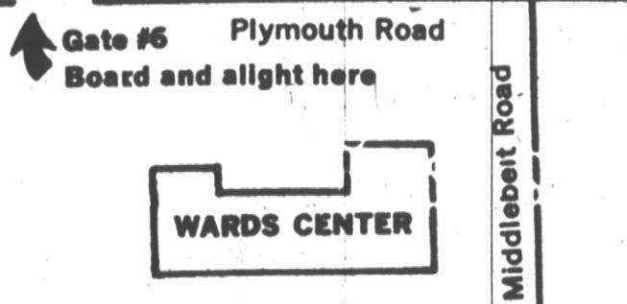
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MOT's opening salutes bicentennial

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History and beauty emerge from scrap metal

Out of one man's compassion and creativity and many people's junkyards and flea markets has grown an exhibit that is causing Livonia Mall shoppers to stop hurrying and contemplate.

The show, on during store hours through Sunday, June 22, is titled "Jewish History in Metal," and its creator is Henry Friedman, who insists "I'm not an artist—I'm a tool and die maker."

But artistry is undeniable in the group of more than a dozen metal sculptures. It joins with an inner peace that springs, perhaps, from Friedman's long-ago years in German concentration camps and his appreciation his good life today.

It's all scrap metal in his works, this Oak Park resident points out. Well, maybe except for the silver spoon he needed for Goliath's armor and appropriated from the family silver drawer. "My wife missed it when she polished silver the next time," he admitted a bit sheepishly.

ALSO NOT EXACTLY scrap were the valuable guns he took apart for a sculpture that is at once a memorial for the dead and a plea for peace. The polished wood stocks of guns form the base; small metal parts of weapons spell out the words "Peace for All Mankind."

Incorporated into the work is a partial list of concentration camps—"there wasn't room to list all of them"—and, outlined in tiny bullets, a Star of David with a cross inside.

"Because this is for everyone," Friedman said. "More than Jews have died in the concentration camps."

"My friends at the shop couldn't believe I would destroy two rifles for this purpose. They asked how I could do it. I said it was easy."

There are many Biblical scenes depicted in the art works. You see David and Goliath, and Moses standing beside the burning bush and holding aloft the Ten Commandments written in Hebrew, and Samson about to bring down the temple.

Bringing Jewish and lore history more up to date, there's a scene showing a rabbi and the robot Golem and one titled "Israel I, Interplanetary space Station."

FRIEDMAN'S WORK dates back about 10 years. It started when he was working as a trouble-shooter in Congress Tool & Die in Hamtramck and found his days filled with more time than trouble.

"There was a pile of scrap metal in the corner and I wanted something to do, so I welded some pieces together," he said. The man-like creature he brought home amazed his wife, who suggested he make another. The next day his foreman "started to chew me out, then asked if I'd make him one."

After a few welded figures, presented to the foreman and the president and the vice-president of the firm, Friedman started thinking about more serious works.

"I decided to do a memorial for my

parents," he said. German Jews, Bernard and Amalia Friedman had perished in the gas chamber of the Belzec concentration camp in Poland.

Their son had spent four years in various camps during World War II, but escaped the chamber because he could be used in an airplane factory. He came to this country as a displaced person in 1947.

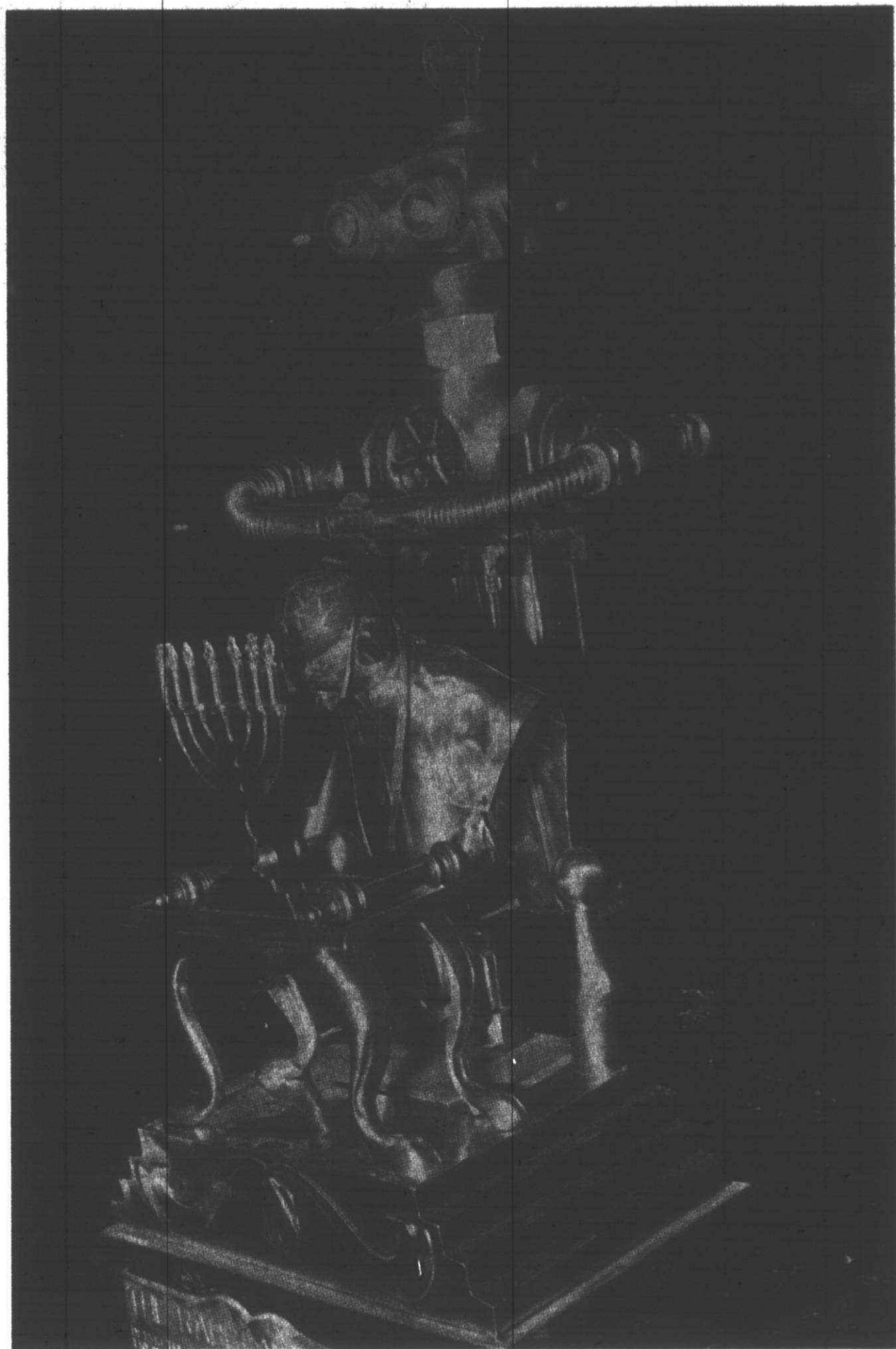
"I ACCUSE" is the title of the memorial. It shows a figure holding a model of a camp and a grave. A judge is condemning the world for the atrocities committed against the Jews, he said.

That Friedman loves working with the cast-off bearings, pistons, nails, cylinders and countless other metal parts that go into his works is obvious from his descriptions.

For his Rabbi and Golem, for instance, he explained that the story didn't describe the weapon used by the superhuman robot to frighten the enemies of the Jews, "so I gave him a thunderbolt with a Jewish star."

And Creation, he decided, needed a figure to go with the circling spheres, made out of rings of brass he sawed from a huge pipe.

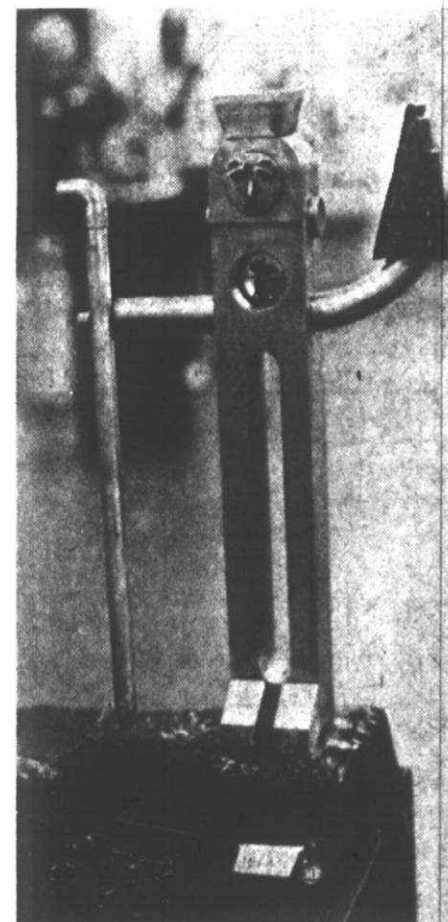

THE RABBI and the Golem



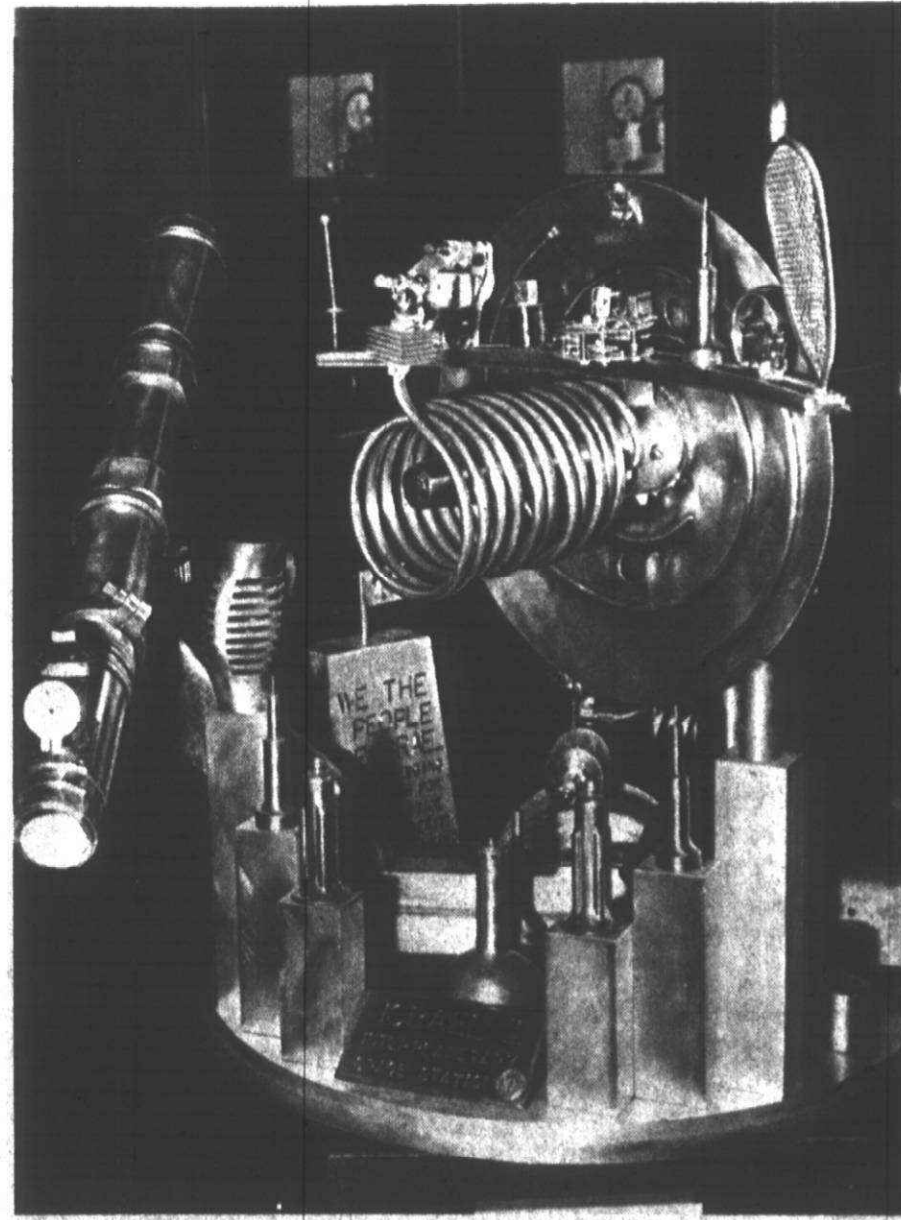
HENRY FRIEDMAN with Creation
