

Board decides Agardy to stay at Canton High

A decision that has been hanging fire before the Plymouth Board of Education for almost a year was reached at Monday night's meeting when the board defeated a motion to allow David Agardy to attend Plymouth Salem High School.

The vote was unanimous with one member absent.

The matter was brought to a conclusion by a motion by Trustee E.J. McClelland: "That in recognition that his parents made a decision on a

home selection in the apparent erroneous view that all their children were assured attendance in Plymouth Salem High School that the attendance policy be suspended in the case of David Agardy only and that the request of his parents for his attendance at Plymouth Salem High School be approved."

The motion was seconded by Board Secretary George Lawton.

Although some discussion followed, and Attorney Maurie Breen was al-

lowed to say a few words on behalf of his clients, the Agardys, the motion failed by a 6-0 vote with only one member, Joseph Gray, absent from the Labor Day meeting.

McClelland said that "because the request was made over a year ago" the board "should act on it."

Board President Marda Benson allowed Breen to speak after he pointed out that Trustees Gary Mirto, Tom Yack, and George Lawton had been absent from last week's meeting when he made his presentation.

Mirto said, "Most parents like to have their children in the same school."

"But you cannot guarantee unalterable school boundaries," said Yack.

"The whole matter of school attendance could become absolutely unmanageable," according to McClelland.

Mirto asked if there were educational reasons for the request to allow Paul Agardy to attend Plymouth Salem instead of Plymouth Canton.

"Parents have petitioned to allow

students to attend other districts when a child could be materially damaged by the discipline or instruction of another school," said Mirto. But because of an "athletic potential" it seemed "discriminatory to say Salem is superior to Canton."

AFTER THE motion failed by an unanimous "no" vote, Breen asked for a transcript of the discussion preceding the vote. Mrs. Benson said he could have one.

Vice president Marcia Borowski read a statement of board reasoning on the issue. After several deletions, it was accepted by the members of the board.

The adopted statement follows:

Although we may not have yet developed the ultimate in the ways in which we assign our children to schools, our current policy at the Centennial Education Park is based on the middle school feeder system.

"Due to the fact that ours is a growing district—boundary lines for the middle schools are changed frequently—it is almost impossible to know with certainty which schools a child will be attending throughout his or her educational career in Plymouth."

"We do not see this situation as inherently bad. We strive to maintain equal quality and opportunities at each of our schools."

"The situation of school assignment at the park, in particular, has its rationale and its effect, that of maximizing opportunities for each child. Educational programs offered at either building are open to each and every child at the Park according to his or her needs and interests."

"Some programs are duplicated at each building so as to allow for more

participation by an increased number of students.

"For the philosophy of public high school education is to allow each child a variety of pursuits and activities to explore and experience, and not to restrict such activities to the few, be they talented, motivated or the rich whose parents may have provided them with additional training, equipment, etc."

"Thus we have individual high school identities at the Centennial Education Park to allow more participation in inter-scholastic sports as well as some other activities such as debate, school government, etc."

"For any student to attend Canton, as his feeder school dictates, will afford him every educational opportunity that Plymouth has to offer. Hopefully, it will also allow him to determine for himself just exactly what goals he will pursue—rather than having predetermined roles thrust upon him."

"This board constantly keeps in mind that every child in the Plymouth Community School District must be allowed the opportunity to develop his or her maximum potential in a number of ways. This includes academic as well as physical, social and cultural areas."

"Every attempt is made to meet each child's needs and concerns in so far as is practical, as will be supported financially by the public, and which doesn't discriminate against other children."

"Our attendance boundaries will doubtless change again. But, at the CEP, this board feels that these changes impose no hardship or lack of educational opportunity for the families and their children involved."

Special Scouts need donations

This fall is not just another autumn for girls at Our Lady of Providence Catholic School.

About 30 girls, who range in age from seven to 21 and board in the special education institution, will don the green uniforms of scouting this fall and become what they call "real, live" Girl Scouts.

"Take one trip to the school and ask them what they're going to do this fall," said Yvonne Isaacson, who hopes to establish three Girl Scout troops at the school. "They know what a Girl Scout is. Why can't they be part of it?"

"When they leave the school, they'll have experienced part of the outside world through scouting. They need that. They have no real outside contact right now."

TO ESTABLISH the troops at the Northville facility and fulfill the expectations of the girls, Mrs. Isaacson needs the aid of Plymouth-Canton residents as well as those of Northville.

Corresponding with the recruitment drive of the National Girl Scouts of America and the Huron Valley Girl Scout Council, Mrs. Isaacson is conducting a recruitment drive of her own. Help and materials needed to establish the troops include:

- Troop leaders to head the scouting activities. Because many of the girls come from locations in Michigan and neighboring states, their parents are unable to assume the leadership roles.
- Help from local senior and cadet Girl Scout troops with scouting activities at the school. Local scouts could earn badges through their work.
- Girl Scout uniform donations. Uniforms to fit 7- through 21-year-olds are needed.
- Scraps of material, old catalogues, crayons and pencils are needed for craft projects.
- Persons wishing to donate materials or aid in the establishment of the troops may leave a message for Mrs.

Isaacson at Our Lady of Victory, 770 Thayer, Northville.

THE MOTHER OF four young children, Mrs. Isaacson first conceived the idea of scouting projects at Our Lady of Providence through work with her daughter's Brownie Troop and memories of her own scouting days.

"I feel scouting is more than camping and cook-outs," the Brownie mother and leader explained. "I wanted the Brownies to be more involved in community services. The only way they're going to accept people different from themselves is through exposure at an early age."

But, to Mrs. Isaacson's regret, attempts to initiate Brownie projects at the school met opposition from parents and school administrators, who felt Brownies are too young to handle the situation at the school.

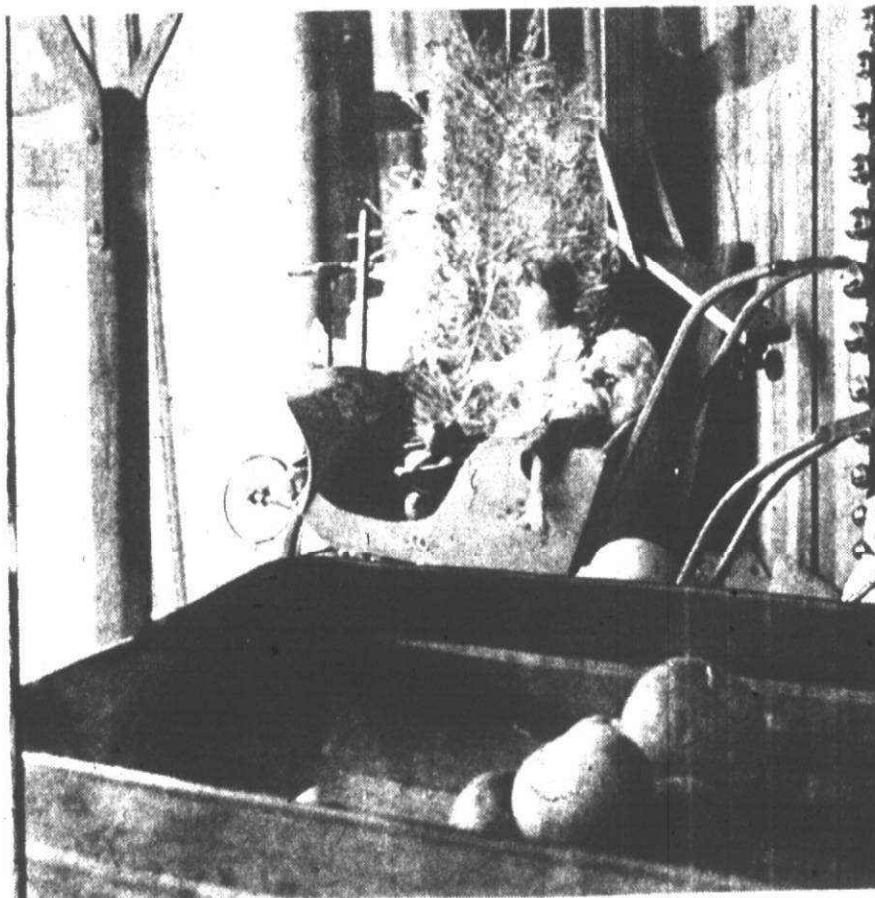
"It just snowballed from there," Mrs. Isaacson explained. "I thought, 'Why can't the girls be Scouts themselves?' I hope Girl Scouts eventually opens up and has a wider field than it has right now."

Scouting, in Mrs. Isaacson's mind, should involve numerous community services. The troops at Our Lady of Providence, she believes, will offer local Scouts numerous opportunities to help out.

"I think it's better to earn a badge helping the handicapped than baking cookies, that's what scouting is all about—community services."

"I was a Girl Scout," Mrs. Isaacson reminisced, "and I really remember my Brownie and Girl Scout days. One of the things that stays with me the most was a trip to an 'old folks' home. We started to sing, and one of the old people said, 'The angels are singing.'"

"All these girls at Our Lady of Providence talk about September and Girl Scouts. They really need the outside activities. If we make at least one girl happy, it will be worth it all."

Shaker musical grant approved

The thoughts of Plymouth Symphony Society members are filled with shaking and trembling these days, as work on the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra's bicentennial concert turns to the story line and musical score.

The Michigan Council for the Arts has approved the society's \$2,800 matching grant request and given the go-ahead signal for work to begin on the specially commissioned folk ballet.

Centered on the Shakers, an early American religious group which practiced a "shaking" movement in its religious ceremonies, the ballet will fill the free hours and thoughts of two specially commissioned local artists for weeks to come.

Robert W. Jones, a music instructor at Schoolcraft College, will soon prepare a musical score pad for the upcoming event, while Ralph Kelley, a Plymouth resident and English instructor at Schoolcraft, will write the story line.

ALTHOUGH THE folk ballet is scheduled for a March 7 performance, preparation for the concert will begin long before the winter winds are blowing.

Kelley must first write the story line. Then Jones must write the music. Symphony Society members must locate a dance group to perform the Shaker folk dance steps. The dancers must mold the choreography to the music.

"With any piece of creativity, you never know how long it'll take until you're half way through," said Jones of the task before him. "I know how long it better not take—it better be finished by January."

The Shaker theme of the bicentennial concert was the brainchild of Plymouth Symphony Society members.

"We were tossing around ideas for a project that would be bicentennial and depict a certain aspect of our history with music," explained Dr. Ralph Atchley, secretary of the Symphony Society. "They wrote many hymns, and all their dances were original. Music was a very important part of their religious ceremonies."

JONES WILL base music for the concert on Kelley's story line and a collection of original Shaker tunes.

Although most of the Shakers' music was vocal with little instrumentation, the composer will use an almost full symphony orchestra to carry out his work.

"It isn't going to be ultra-modern," said Jones of his upcoming bicentennial creation. "They'll be a bit of dissonance and grumbling and noise, but only if the drama warrants it."

Kelley has already begun writing the story for the folk ballet, expected to last about a half hour, based on the true story of a young couple who fell in love and wished to marry in a Kentucky Shaker community.

A common and run-of-the-mill theme in any other setting, the marriage plans touch off bits of sadness and humor in the Shaker community, where marriage is forbidden and complete celibacy the rule.

The Shakers, who believed their founder, Mother Ann, was the embodiment of Christ in his second coming, believed in the equality and complete segregation of the sexes as well as a communal society.

Kelley, who had studied the Shaker society and religion long before the Symphony Society broached its idea for a bicentennial concert, feels the Shakers provide a fitting theme for a 1976 celebration concert.

"I've had quite an interest in these people for some time," said Kelley. "I believe some of the greatest contributions to the United States have come from the various Protestant sects. Their folk stories should really be captured. So much of our heritage is being lost."

Kelley has published numerous stories and plays, based on the true folk stories of America's religious sects.

ALTHOUGH JONES has never written music around a Shaker theme, he has composed numerous commissioned works for various organizations. His works include "A Mass in Motion," composed for Schoolcraft College, and a special overture for the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra, created to celebrate the orchestra's first concert in Plymouth Salem High School.

Musical compositions, according to Jones, "just grow in your head after awhile."

"If I'm writing a piece for keyboard, I use the piano to make sure the music makes sense," said Jones, who plays piano, organ and harpsichord. "For a symphony, it's more of a detriment to play at the piano. It's better to go off in a corner and just jot things down, as if you were taking notes for something."

Jones hopes to begin work on the Shaker composition, after another work, commissioned by the Episcopal Diocese of Detroit, is complete.

Lunch program for elderly starts 2nd year in schools

The resumption of classes in Plymouth Community School District is going to affect the stomachs of senior citizens this year.

Beginning Sept. 15, senior citizens who live within the district may put away their lunch-time cooking utensils and savor the inexpensive, well-balanced meals they enjoyed last spring at Central Middle School, located at Church and Main in downtown Plymouth.

Started as a one-month pilot program at the middle school last May, the SPICE project (School Programs Including Community Elderly) will continue at Central Middle School this year. The program may move to additional locations within the district at a later date.

According to plans of school district

officials, the program will begin at Central Middle School on Sept. 15 and run Monday through Friday from noon to 1 p.m. The program is open to all senior citizens in the district.

Cost of the hot Type-A lunch, which includes nutritious food from all four food groups, will not rise from last year's 80-cent level. The same luncheon is served to students and faculty members.

Gus Gorguze, principal of Central Middle School who spearheaded the SPICE program within the Plymouth Community School District, says the program proved successful on last year's trial run.

Students were encouraged to mingle with faculty members last year to improve communication between the two age groups.

"We were very pleased with the program," said Gorguze. "It's a community kind of thing—an opportunity for the young people to appreciate the old and for the older people to see the school in operation. It's an effort to

bridge the communications gap, if there is one.

"This kind of thing has to come naturally though," Gorguze said. "We didn't get a rush of young people toward the senior citizens, but we did get a few aggressive ones. We would eventually like a few of the young people sitting with the senior citizens and a few of the senior citizens sitting with the students."

An average of 10 senior citizens last year attended the lunch program each day, Gorguze said.

The program was implemented at Central Middle School last year, after Gorguze learned of similar programs in other school districts and organized a committee of school administrators, senior citizens, parents, teachers and cafeteria managers to determine the need of such a program in Plymouth.

Cadillac dealer slates move

Don Massey Cadillac, Inc., may soon move from its Plymouth location to a Canton Township site.

The Canton Board of Trustees recently approved site plans for the dealership's proposed building at the southwest corner of Lilley and Ford.

Jack Clayton, manager of Don Massey Cadillac, said the new \$1 million facility will replace the dealership's current facility at 684 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth, which, he says, is antiquated and too small. Construction work on the new building will begin shortly.

Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein said dealership officials have agreed to abide by the township's recently enacted sign ordinance and pave the bottom of a storm ditch at the rear of their property.

Paving of the ditch, which abuts residential property, will eliminate erosion and maintenance problems, Greenstein said.

"His summer involvement was strictly recreational," says Thomann. "I in no way included him in my plans for this coming year, knowing that the enrollment boundaries had changed."

David had two older brothers—Tom, a seven-foot center for Allen Park who helped lead that team into the state quarter-finals; and Eric, a 6-8 center who was instrumental in leading the Plymouth Salem Rocks into the state semi-finals last year. Neither Tom nor Eric were all-stars, although both earned athletic scholarships.

According to the British Consul, the Queen will visit one day each in Washington, D.C., Philadelphia, New York and Boston.

Her visit, according to the present schedule, will be made after July 4, 1976.

Board adopts goals for Plymouth schools

The management-by-objectives system being initiated in the Plymouth Community School District took another step forward Monday night when the board of education approved goals for the district.

The board adopted the 24 goals and ranked them by importance.

The first goal has already been obtained, that being to pilot the Plymouth Evaluation and Planning System for Improving Instruction (PEPSII).

THE SECOND goal titled "self-worth" states each person needs to develop a positive self-image within his own heritage and within his larger context with the total society.

Other goals are:

•**Equality of educational opportunity**—Education must be structured to provide equality of educational opportunity for all to assure there is no institutionalized oppression of any group, such as racism, where it exists.

The district must assure all programs give full recognition and proper weight to the contributions of all groups and create a school climate to accommodate the diverse values in society.

•**Citizenship and social responsibility**—Develop mature and responsible citizens; encourage critical, constructive thinking and responsible involvement with consideration for the rights of all, create an atmosphere of social justice to enable students to acquire a positive attitude about human differences and similarities; and to provide various learning experiences involving students from different racial, religious, economic and ethnic groups.

•**Creative, constructive and critical thinking**—Foster skills of creative, constructive and critical thinking to enable the individual to deal with situations new to his experience in an independent, self-fulfilling manner.

•**Social skills and understanding**—Provide for each individual an understanding of the value systems, cultures, customs and histories of his own heritage and that of others. Each student must learn to value human differences, act responsibly upon current social issues, participate in society and government while seeking to improve them, and seek a society "where every person has equal access to the lawful goals he seeks regardless of his background or group membership."

•**Basic skills**—Assure acquisition of basic communication, computation and inquiry skills.

These skills fall into four broad categories: abilities to comprehend ideas through reading and listening; to communicate ideas through writing and speaking; to handle mathematical operations and concepts; and the ability to apply rational intellectual processes to identification, consideration and solution of problems.

•**Physical and mental well-being**—Promote acquisition of good health and safety habits.

•**Preparation for family life**—Provide atmosphere in which each individual will grow in his understanding of needs and responsibilities inherent in family life.

•**Pre-school education**—Recognize importance of pre-school experiences to the total development of children and work with parents and other agencies to provide meaningful programs.

Parental participation was the eleventh stated goal with the district wanting to find ways to involve parents in the educational development of their children. Other goals are:

•**Community participation**—Develop means to use community resources and making these resources available to community.

•**Occupational skills**—Develop individual's marketable skills so a student is assisted in reaching career goals by adequate preparation in school.

•**Sciences, arts and humanities**—Provide continually to each individual opportunity and encouragement to gain knowledge and experience in the areas of the natural sciences, social sciences, humanities, creative and the fine arts to enrich his personal values and approach to living.

•**Allocation of financial resources**—Ensure availability and quality of publicly financed education be maintained at acceptable levels.

"The inability of local communities to muster sufficient resources to meet their needs must not be allowed to de-

prive individuals of quality education," the goals state.

•**Education of the exceptional person**—Provide for the special educational needs of exceptional persons—those who are considered academically talented and those who are physically, mentally or emotionally handicapped.

•**Environmental quality**—Develop within each individual the knowledge and respect needed to maintain, protect and improve the physical environment.

•**Economic understanding**—Provide

that every student will gain an understanding of his role as a producer and consumer of goods and services and of the principles involved in the production of goods and services.

•**Continuing Education**—Promote an eagerness for learning to encourage each individual to take advantage of educational opportunities available beyond formal schooling.

•**Rights and responsibilities of students**—Recognize and protect the individual and legal rights of students as people and as citizens.

With these rights, students must ac-

cept responsibilities and disciplines essential to society. Also recognized is the corresponding rights of parents, teachers and other participants in the educational process.

•**Career preparation**—Provide each individual the chance to select and prepare for a career of his choice consistent to the optimum degree with his capabilities, aptitudes, desires, and needs of society.

•**Morality**—Assure the development of youth as citizens who have self-respect, respect for others, and respect for the law.

•**Preparation for a changing society**—Prepare the student to become responsive to the needs created and opportunities afforded by an ever-changing social, economic and political environment.

•**Education of the non-English speaking person**—Recognize the need for special measures in schools serving students whose native tongue is one other than English. These students should be encouraged to develop their skills in their native language while acquiring proficiency in English.

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Bloc grants are OK'd for area

Federal Community Development Act (CDA) grants have been approved for the City of Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth townships.

Each municipality will receive \$32,950, a figure arrived at by Wayne County based on population.

The city plans to use its federal funds to undertake a code enforcement program.

Plymouth Township plans to develop two playgrounds, complete recreation and development plan for a township golf course and recreation site.

Canton Township plans to use its funds to develop a park and to rehabilitate a building for senior citizen and recreation use.

THE FUNDS, destined for public works projects to spur employment were received through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners applied for a grant of \$637,000 on behalf and at the request of 17 municipalities in Wayne County, including Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth townships.

Besides the \$637,000, another \$78,500 will be retained in a central fund for housing needs. Any of the 17 localities and the county may apply to this fund to finance rehabilitation of vacant housing units or for planning of senior citizen housing, explains Roscoe L.

Bobo, chairman of the county board of commissioners.

THE CENTRAL FUND will be controlled by the Wayne County Community Development Advisory Council which consists of five elected county officials and 10 elected local officials. Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein is chairman of the advisory council.

In announcing the grant, Bobo described the successful bid for funds as "a strong first-year start" which "will set the stage for more appropriate HUD funding in future years."

"I consider this grant significant because it is another demonstration of how Wayne County functions as a coordinator for the communities with-

in county boundaries."

Communities with populations of more than 50,000 were eligible to apply directly to HUD for grants. Smaller municipalities, such as these 17, had the option to apply through county government.

Each of the 17 community's plans for use of funds were screened by the advisory council. Other members of the advisory council included Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren, Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch, and County Commissioner Royce E. Smith (D-Belleville) who represents Plymouth and Canton.

Other communities among the 17 applying through Wayne County include Allen Park, Brownstown Township, Ecorse, Flat Rock, Grosse Ile, Grosse Pointe, Sumpter Township, Gibraltar, Grosse Pointe Park, Northville City and Township, Melvindale, Southgate and Van Buren Township.

The CDA of 1974 was an umbrella bill which placed a number of former community development and revenue-sharing type grants into one grant program and under the direction of one federal department.

This is the first year CDA funding has been appropriated.

Umney trial begins today

The first degree murder trial of Robert Umney for the Jan. 28 shooting death of Terry Buchman in Canton Township will get under way today (Thursday) before Wayne Circuit Court Judge Horace Gilmore in Detroit.

Opening statements will be made by Prosecutor Richard Whitney and Robert B. Delaney of Plymouth, attorney for the defendant.

Jury selection was completed on Tuesday, but Judge Gilmore served on a judicial tenure commission on Wednesday, postponing proceedings until today.

Two other members of the trio charged in the slaying were Barry Provow and his wife, Leslie Provow was granted a separate non-jury trial before Judge Thomas J. Roumell. Roumell will place his decision on Provow in a sealed envelope on Friday, Sept. 5. It will be filed with the county clerk and released after a decision is reached in Umney's trial.

Mrs. Provow pleaded guilty to manslaughter. Judge Roumell accepted her plea and she awaits sentencing Sept. 17.

Lockers approved for East

New lockers will be installed within the next six weeks at Middle School East to replace worn out models that have been in use since the school was built.

The Plymouth Board of Education accepted a bid of \$8,193 from Steel Equipment Co., the lowest of nine bids received. The lockers will be funded by the 1974 bond issue.

"I was delighted to hear the board had approved the new lockers," said Taylor. "Now we will have room to store expensive equipment that was left out while other organizations used the building."

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In Wayne-Westland

Workload of a school trustee

"The board had always seemed like a mystical body to me before," says Agnes Greene, newest member of the Wayne-Westland Board of Education. "But now I've had a chance to see just how hard they work."

Mrs. Greene, who took office this summer, says being a school board member presented no surprises to her, except for the requirements on each board member's time.

"It's a good thing I'm retired," she says. "Otherwise I just don't see how a person could manage to attend the meetings, study sessions and conferences."

"It's not just a matter of working

from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. every other Monday," she says. "It's usually more like 6 p.m. to 11 p.m. every Monday."

She says the public's impression of the amount of work required to be a board member, and the realities of the job are quite different.

"They see us when we come in to a board meeting and spend maybe 15 minutes on a discussion of a certain topic. What they often don't realize is that a lot of time has gone into the matter beforehand," she says.

Mrs. Greene says board members put in three or four hours of preparatory work for every meeting. She and her associates would be spending even more time on their jobs, she said, if the W-W district were negotiating teacher contracts this fall (the district faces negotiations next spring).

"It's also kind of depressing," she says, "that we're discussing hiring only 50 or 60 teachers. I recall, when I was a teacher, as many as 400 teachers would be added to the staff," she says.

Perhaps not surprisingly, she has found matters involving school finances the most difficult part of the job to assimilate. She says an assortment of federal grants, state aid formulas and local levies give board members plenty of material to study.

Each board member, she says, has a computer readout indicating every bill that has been paid by the school administration. At meetings, the public often hears only a token discussion of bills for payment segment of a meeting because board members have reviewed the material in advance of the meeting.

SHE PRAISES the "teamwork" of

the W-W board but denies they are simply "yes men" for School Supt. Timothy Dyer.

"Dyer's cabinet screens things beforehand and then it goes to the superintendent and then to the board. People don't realize how much argument has already taken place on an issue before it gets to a board meeting," says Mrs. Greene.

She says she is impressed with the Dyer "cabinet," a group of specialists he has brought into the system. "They're a good group of young persons. I think they're trying very hard to handle the problems facing the district. There's a good team relationship."

She believes the money problem is the most important one facing the administration.

"We're a big business, with a budget of more than \$30 million," Mrs. says she plans to visit 30 schools in the district during her term of office. She says she wants to find out more about "individual learning" especially at the elementary school level.

She will attend the Michigan Association of School Boards workshop this month and says her retiree status has proven to be "an asset" in fulfilling board demands.

"It certainly beats knitting," she concludes.

Alarm system installed to foil vandals in W-W

Vandalism in school districts has often been considered a cause for alarm. Consequently, the Wayne-Westland School District has been using an alarm for its cause.

Called "Audio Alert," the system has been keeping a silent vigil in designated buildings throughout the district. According to Tom Blacklock, deputy superintendent for operations:

"We've found that the vandalism rate in those schools that have the system has gone down considerably. I'd estimate that we've saved about \$10,000 with the device."

A monthly fee is required; but Blacklock says that is more than offset by the savings that have resulted since the system was installed.

"A stolen typewriter worth \$350 far exceeds the monthly cost of the system in a school building," he says. Actually, a couple of stolen typewriters would result in greater losses than operating the system for a year.

The system has not been an expensive one to install, according to Blacklock, because it uses some equipment already in the buildings, such as intercoms.

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SEMTA reduces bus fares for handicapped

The cost of traveling on SEMTA/ DOT buses has been reduced for handicapped persons.

SEMTA, the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority, Aug. 4 initiated a discount fare program for non-peak hour service on all regular bus routes operated by SEMTA and the Detroit Department of Transportation (DOT).

Non-peak hours are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday; all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

DURING NON-PEAK operating hours, the fare for the handicapped

will be 20 cents including service on express lines and five cents for all transfers.

In addition to implementing the handicapped fare discounts, free fares for the blind and senior citizens will be retained. Senior citizens must observe the non-peak hour limitations of the handicapped, while the blind may ride free at any time.

An identification card is required only for the reduced fare on SEMTA/ DOT buses. Application forms and instructions for obtaining the special fare identification passes are avail-

able by writing SEMTA, P.O. Box 333, Detroit, 48231. Forms can also be obtained by calling SEMTA in Detroit.

THE ELDERLY and handicapped will be further aided with any transportation problems by a state grant which will purchase 51 specially equipped small buses and auxiliary equipment for private non-profit agencies.

The agencies, such as Kiwanis clubs, county associations for the elderly and retarded and community action groups, will serve the mobility-limited persons on a door-to-door basis, and cover operating expenses

with their own funds, said John P. Woodford, director of state highways and transportation.

In areas already served by local bus or other transportation services, the private agencies will supplement that service in outlying areas not well covered.

The state grants require that agencies offer general transportation

service to the elderly and handicapped without the limitation of one or two destinations. The new program not only assures continued transportation help to those who need it most, but also expands service to the handicapped and elderly in Michigan, said Woodford.

SEMTA now does not provide service to wheelchair residents.

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County orders freeze on hiring

In an effort to lessen a threatened \$7 million-\$10 million budget deficit, the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has ordered new spending restrictions and imposed an immediate

moratorium on hiring except at the County General Hospital.

The budget threat exists because the current economic slump has reduced revenues to the county, and be-

cause funds previously expected from the state and the City of Detroit now seem unlikely this year, according to the County Board of Auditors and the commissioners' fiscal advisor, Edward E. Bobowski.

The three-member board of auditors has predicted funds previously expected from the City of Detroit and the State would reduce the projected deficit to only \$1.2 million, but both Bobowski and auditor vice-chairman Leonard D. Proctor have expressed faint hopes for the money.

In the job moratorium declared Aug. 21, the commissioners ordered a halt on filling any jobs that become vacant except those "deemed absolutely essential and critical to operation of Wayne County government."

Although a requirement for special permission from a "vacant positions committee" has been in effect for the past two years, this action tightened the criteria even further with its "absolutely essential and critical" requirement.

The hospital was exempted because of concern that vacant jobs could affect the quality of health care, and to assure staff requirements necessary to preserve the hospital's accreditation.

The commissioners also transferred \$3.5 million from the capital improvement fund to meet operating expenses, with a stipulation that the money is considered a "loan" that will be returned to the fund when the fiscal situation improves.

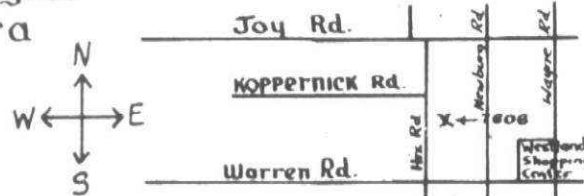

Union pacts cost jobs of members

Where is the labor movement today? The number of people involved in organized labor is increasing, because of newcomers such as state and municipal workers and school teachers. But the number of craft and industrial unionists is decreasing.

Unions serve their purpose at first, but then can become counterproductive.

Union leaders are human beings and hold their posts only if they continue to get more for their members. They create a feeling that management is bad and is out to take advantage of the worker, instead of working to make both the employee and the employer prosper.

OFTEN UNIONS fail to take into account the fact that employers can pay more only if there is more productivity from employees. If productivity isn't increased, eventually the increased labor cost erases the margin of profit and the business is forced to close. But even after the business closes, the union leader holds his job, while his members roam the streets.

A case in point is the desire of the auto workers to negotiate a four-day week for five-days' pay. Their purpose is to get more people working. But it means that auto companies will have to increase prices by 10 to 20 percent or automate more jobs, meaning that fewer people will end up working for higher pay.

MANY UNION leaders don't care if the gains

at the bargaining table mean that, in the end, fewer people will be working. The non-worker seldom votes at union elections.

There are still more than 60,000 printers out of work in New York because of the closing of so many newspapers and print shops that couldn't meet labor's demands.

Somehow, labor leaders are like politicians. After they have held office for a while, they no longer listen to the rank and file. They begin to feel that they know all the answers. They get involved in great political causes that, in the long run, could cost members' jobs.

LEONARD WOODCOCK is a great liberal. He's also a great environmentalist. His push for cleaner air has raised the price of cars and decreased demand. Now he's blaming the government.

He is also a great civil rights man, but the affirmative-action programs to give jobs to minorities conflicts with the seniority system of unions when employees must be laid off.

There are other labor leaders who use union positions for personal financial gain.

It's ironic that the Teamsters, whose last two presidents have ended up in jail, and whose most recent president has just built a \$250,000 home, have organized the Michigan State Police.

ARTICLES IN THE Wall Street Journal indicate a large number of Teamsters are cheated

out of pensions because of internal finagling. Yet the members of the Mafia have no trouble borrowing from Teamster pension funds and don't always get around to paying off the loans.

There are laws on the books that prevent companies from being involved in politics. But there are more laws that encourage unions to be involved. The newest so-called "reform" election law in Michigan is an example. It permits unions to contribute 10 times the amount an ordinary citizen can.

AS LONG AS union leaders are permitted political power, the rank and file unionist is powerless to clean up his union. His leadership is so entrenched that an officer can be serving time in the federal prison for stealing from the union and still hold a very high paying job with the union.

If Labor Day is to have any meaning, isn't it time for the rank and file to flex their muscles and start to tell their leaders the facts of life?

MORE MONEY does not necessarily mean more jobs.

Work rules that are so out of date that employers must resort to automation do not solve unemployment problems.

Only a healthy employer can improve working conditions and pay top dollar.

To solve the problems of America, labor and management must work together. If each seeks only its own selfish ends, both will suffer.

Gardeners -share bounty with needy

CAN ANYONE THINK OF A BETTER IDEA?



"Anyone need any tomatoes or green peppers?" This is an often-asked question now, when suburban gardeners find Mother Nature has given more than they bargained for.

The answer is yes, yes, yes. The elderly, the unemployed and the hungry could use produce you have left over. No question about it, people all around us would welcome the chance to add fresh fruit and vegetables to their diets.

But there is a question of logistics. How can Mr. Smith with his basketful of tomatoes or apples get in touch with Mrs. Jones who is living on a tiny pension, or with the Johnson family which goes to bed hungry every night?

Collection points are needed for local gardeners to take their surplus. These places could also serve as distribution points, with people from the area dropping in to pick up what they need.

They could also be centers where volunteers could pick up produce and carry it to a senior citizen center, an unemployment office or a hunger center.

This is an endeavor that churches, veterans' organizations or any other group with a building at its disposal might undertake. Members might even volunteer to do the driving.

Gardeners who cultivate plots like those administered by Newman House at Schoolcraft College

could come together for a combined harvest and distribution day. Garden clubs could do the same.

Of course, there are problems that must be thrashed out. Fruit and certain vegetables like tomatoes would have to be packed in wood or cardboard containers to prevent crushing.

Mrs. Eleanor Josaitis, chairwoman of the Detroit mayor's and common council's task force on hunger and nutrition, also suggested that the more delicate kinds of produce be shipped before it has completely ripened, to prevent spoilage.

Stressing that there are thousands in Detroit who desperately need fresh fruit and vegetables, Mrs. Josaitis offered the names of five Detroit organizations which would be willing to distribute surplus food.

Groups and individuals interested in contributing their surplus to the hungry may contact the Metropolitan Council of Churches, or St. Bonaventure Church, 1740 Mt. Eliot.

St. Peter Claver Community House, 450 Eliot, is also interested in receiving food for the hungry, as is the Salvation Army, 3611 Cass, and Focus Hope, 1300 Oakman.

Was politics the issue?

Little guy isn't always right, as farm flap proves

There's a tradition in the newsgathering business of taking the side of the little guy in his battles against the behemoths of giant corporations or big government.

There's another tradition that's even more important: telling the truth. And when the case breaks down to a little farmer versus city hall in one of the half-dozen largest municipalities in Michigan, it just may be that truth is on city hall's side.

Anyway, here's the truth, as close as my colleagues and I can come to it:

BOB CAGLE runs a farm on Seven Mile Road between Farmington and Newburgh and sells pretty good quality stuff. The city is in the process of acquiring and developing the property for a much-needed major park.

WJBK television, known colloquially as TV 2, needed a tear-jerking feature story for its canned news format one Sunday night and sent young Ron Sanders out to see Cagle and family.

Now, TV news comes and goes so quickly that you can't always be quite certain of the exact

words you heard, but the impression most of us who saw it got was that Livonia—its city government and its consuming residents—were doing a dirty deed to farmer Bob by bumping him off his land.

It made good entertainment, and the pictures of the vegetables were as lovely as the real thing (I happened to be there when they were filming it). But many important facts were left out of Ron Sanders' account for TV 2.

HERE'S WHAT was missing:

- The City of Livonia wasn't arbitrarily forcing a poor dirt farmer out of business. Cagle, it should be mentioned, is a renter. The owner was quite happy to sell. Mayor Ed McNamara reports—and there's no reason to doubt him—that a residential developer was offering \$8,000 an acre with an option based on rezoning the land to a higher density residential development. The city's purchase actually saved the land for greenery and recreation. Besides, you can't play softball in a cornfield.

- Most of us in western Wayne County are living and working on former farm fields; a few are

lucky enough to live on former farm woodlots. Why should any responsible broadcaster do a sob story on one particular farmer?

- While farmer Bob got to throw some choice verbal brickbats at the city, TV 2 never bothered to get the city's side of the story. Perhaps the excuse was that it was Sunday, and city hall was closed. Anyhow, McNamara was sore as hell about it, and no one can blame him.

- Farmer Bob wasn't exactly starving to death. His acorn squash was priced 24 per cent higher and his sweet corn 28 per cent higher than a pro-

duce market 1½ miles away. All that publicity was good for his business.

- At this point, the plot thickens and the color becomes a little dirty. A few days after the TV 2 half-story, there appeared right next to farmer Bob's stand a billboard advocating the election of a former mayor in place of McNamara. Which was the chicken and which the egg? Was candidate X at the bottom of it, or did farmer Bob turn to candidate X because he thought X would save his farm?

The thing has gotten so political that there's no point trying to get to the bottom of it. It is sufficient to say that Ed McNamara got a dirty deal from that Sunday night sob story. City Hall wasn't in the wrong.

Rain saved holiday weekend

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
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

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Civic goals: success, failure

With all its admitted advantages, no one has ever claimed that a democratic form of government is the fastest at getting things done. Any system which accepts a pluralistic view of values could never function perfectly without a perfect citizenry, highly educated and unswayed by thoughtless emotion or resigned apathy.

Plymouth has been much like other democratic communities of the same size in solving its civic problems. In some instances, the time gap between recognition of the need and resolution of the problem has been relatively short; in others, longer than it should have been; in a few cases, no solutions have yet been found. In the long run, however, it appears that our civic track record has been surprisingly good.

ONE WAY to assess the achievements of a community is to look at the goals it sets for itself and relate them to what it accomplishes.

What, for example, did residents of Plymouth believe the needs of the community were during the 30-year period from 1932 (when Plymouth became a city) and 1962, and what was done to meet them? A study of the annual reports issued by the city administration during that period sheds light on the matter.

Disregarding comparatively minor items, such as "complete the signing of streets," and "the need for a street-sweeping machine," these were considered to be the major needs of the City of Plymouth during the three decades referred to. They are given roughly in the order in which they were first mentioned:

- A municipal dump, and the institution of municipal garbage collection.
- Cleaning up Tonquish Creek.
- Construction of a grade separation at the C&O railroad tracks on Main Street.
- A community building and auditorium.
- A local hospital.
- A new library building.
- An industrial park on Plymouth Road at Haggerty.
- Clearance of a blighted area on South Mill Street.
- A new city reservoir.
- A new city hall.
- Housing for the aged.

MANY OF THESE showed up in the city's reports year after year.

Tonquish Creek apparently needed attention for well over a decade. The use of cesspools and, in some cases, private sewers emptying directly into the creek, contributed to the problem.

The need for a community building and for a new building for the library were felt long before either was consummated. Need for a grade separation at the railroad tracks was expressed in the city's report as early as 1938.

In spite of these instances of what, to some readers, may appear to be official foot-dragging, the overall record of the City of Plymouth in meeting and solving civic problems has been good.

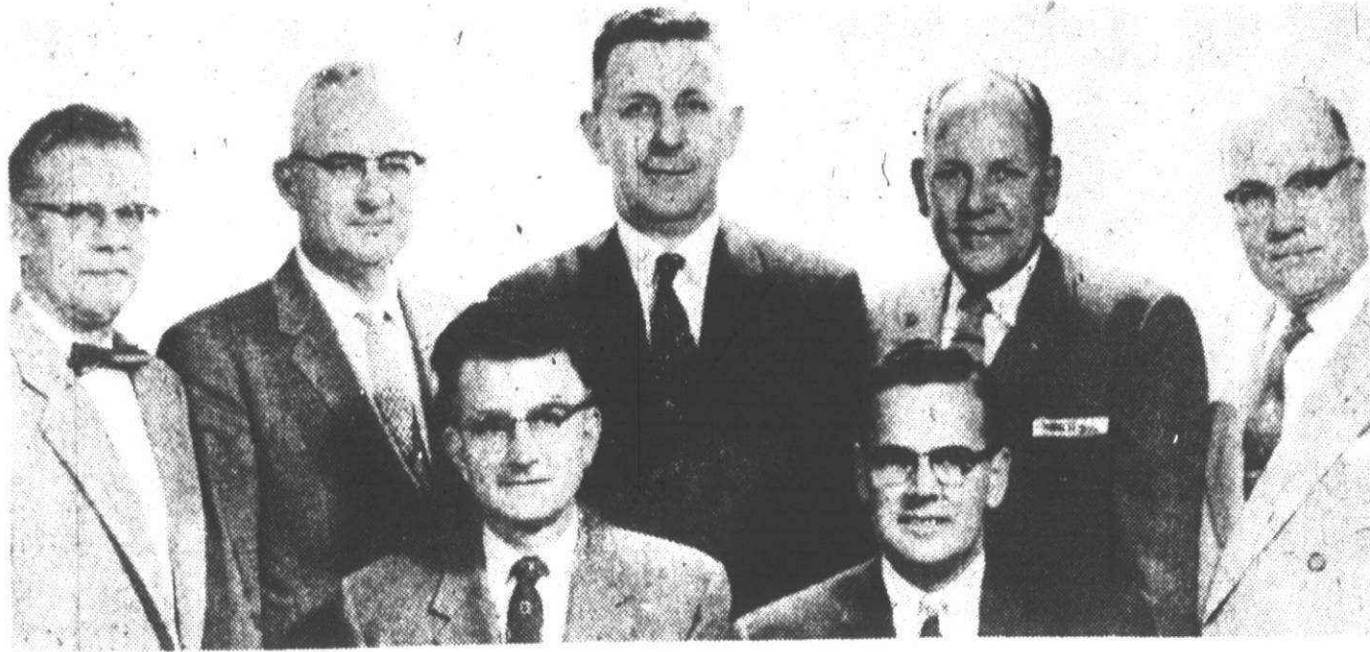
Much has been accomplished despite the obstacles of inflation and public resistance to tax increases, hurdles which any municipal administration must be prepared to face.

A MUNICIPAL dump was obtained in the 1936-37 fiscal year. The city began garbage collection on July 1, 1937. In 1955-56, a sanitary land fill system for the disposal of garbage and refuse was instituted.

Much of Tonquish Creek in the downtown area was piped and covered in 1938-39. One hears no complaints that the stream is a public nuisance today.

The Plymouth Cultural Center, with its meeting rooms and an ice-skating arena, was opened in 1971. A large, well-equipped auditorium was added to the community as part of Plymouth Salem High School in 1970.

Efforts to establish a Plymouth Hospital ceased when St. Mary Hospital, which opened on Five Mile Road in 1962,

von in December 1959, was felt to meet the local needs.

The library, housed in a former residence on Main Street through the generosity of Bessie Dunning and her daughter, Margaret, acquired its present colonial brick quarters on the same site in 1958, assisted by funds from the Hough-Kimble Foundation.

THE CITY'S industrial park, just east of Riverside Cemetery on Plymouth Road, was completed by installation of water, sewers and paving

in 1963. It was developed to bolster the city's tax base and to put into use property that officials felt the cemetery wouldn't need.

Twenty-one substandard houses on 17 acres on S. Mill Street, between Ann Arbor Trail and Amelia Street, were torn down in 1963 under a federal urban renewal grant. The property was zoned for industrial use.

The need for a city reservoir evaporated in 1971 when voters by referendum decided that Plymouth should abandon its own water system and

buy water from the Detroit Water Board.

The old village hall, which had stood since 1880 on Main Street opposite Church Street, was razed in 1964. It made way for the new city hall, now located roughly on the same site.

THE NEED FOR housing for the aged was met, in part at least, by establishment of Tonquish Creek Manor, the locally-managed federal housing unit, at the end of Sheridan Street. It was dedicated in May 1970.

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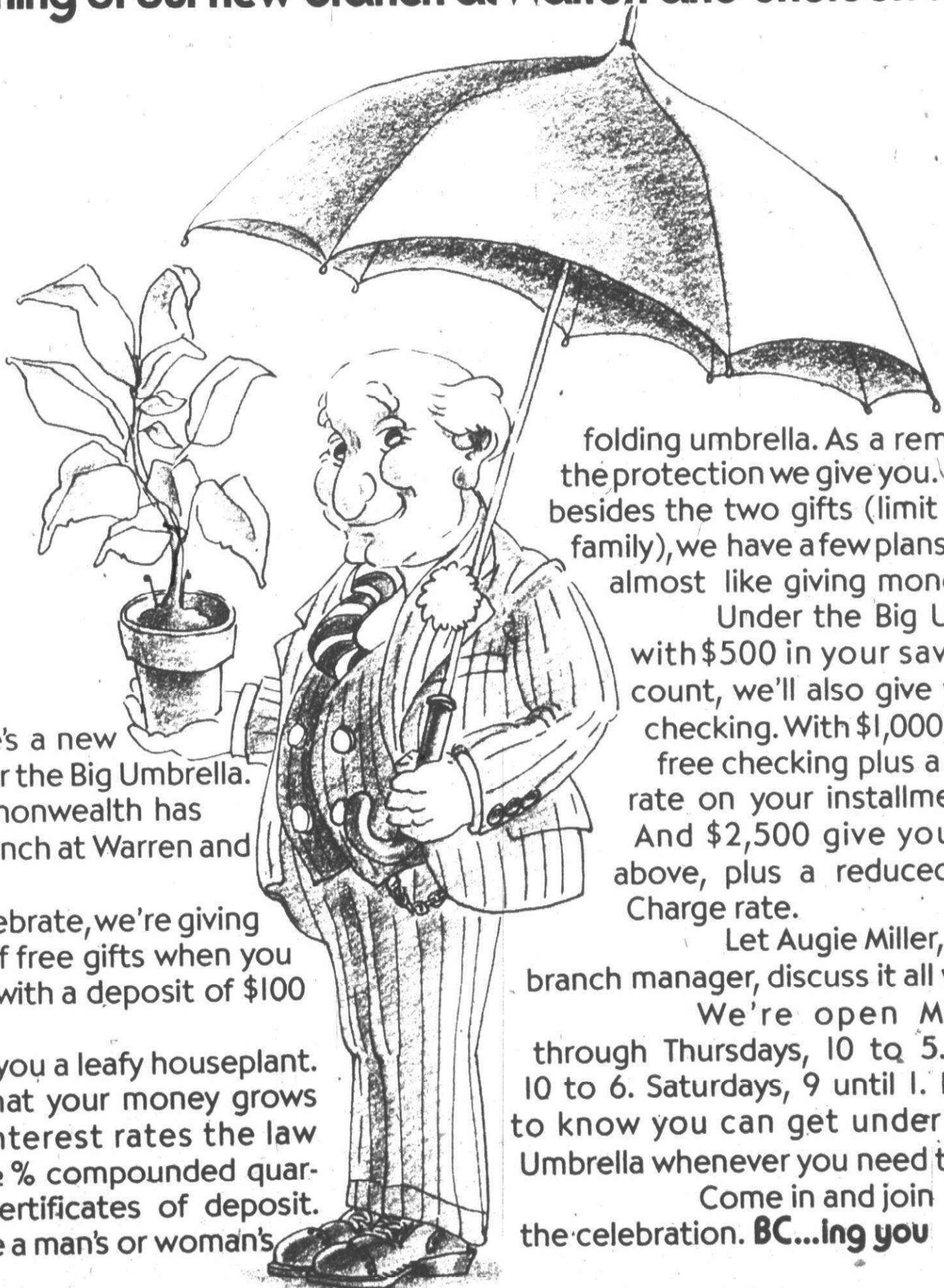
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It's a celebration at Schoolcraft

2 days of events mark International Women's Year

Women in their many life roles will be the subject of an International Women's Year Festival on the Schoolcraft College Campus Wednesday and Thursday, Sept. 17 and 18.

The two-day schedule of events, from exhibits of home arts to a talk by Patricia Burnett, international feminist organizer and feature speaker, is described as "a celebration of ourselves."

"This event is designed to celebrate women, whatever their role in life," said Jean Christensen, head of women's programs and services and coordinator of the festival.

Working with her in scheduling its many events is Lois Wade of Garden City, a member of the SC Women's Advisory Committee and the college's representative at the International Women's Year Tribune in Mexico City earlier this year.

THE FESTIVAL co-sponsored by the Women's Programs division at Schoolcraft and Wayne State University's College of Lifelong Learning, will fill the upper and lower levels of

the Waterman Campus Center both days.

Its scope will include a variety of workshops developed by members of the advisory committee on subjects of interest to women, entertainment by women, exhibits of women's projects and movies of special interest to women.

Just one event will push a male viewpoint, and in that panel discussion, Dr. Ned Papania, Detroit psychologist, and his panel of young men will be talking about women.

The topic for their discussion, scheduled at 3 p.m. Thursday on the center's upper level, is "Does Ms. Mean Misery?"

"We expect this event to be of particular interest to Schoolcraft's younger students," said Mrs. Christensen, "because the participants will be airing some of their reactions to the changing roles of women."

PATRICIA BURNETT, the featured speaker, will offer her slide presentation Wednesday at 8 p.m. on the upper level.

Ms. Burnett, a Detroit resident, is a national board member of the Nation-

al Organization for Women (NOW), a member of the Michigan Women's Commission, and a well-known portrait painter.

She has traveled extensively in Europe and the Far East to help organize a World Feminist Conference projected for 1977, and she was one of Michigan's representatives to the International Women's Year gathering in Mexico City.

In her presentation, she is expected to outline what the growing international women's movement has meant to women in various parts of the world.

WORKSHOPS, planned and led by members of the SC Women's Advisory Committee, will deal with a wide variety of subjects.

WAC from Livonia tells of army living conditions

"For four months, I was the only female living in an all-male barracks," wrote Specialist 4 Jill Jacobs in a letter to the Observer & Eccentric.

However, she was then joined by another WAC, and before long billeting changes again placed her in an all-woman arrangement.

The living accommodation of the Livonia WAC became an issue during a recent debate between those opposing and those favoring passage of the Equal Rights Amendment.

The president of Livonia Republican Women in May referred to the Livonia WAC, without mentioning her name, in a letter announcing that members of her organization voted to ask the Michigan Legislature to rescind its 1972 action supporting ERA.

To buttress the anti-ERA position of the Republican women, Mrs. Jay Glover wrote, "Equal Rights for a Livonia WAC forced her to reside for two years in an all-male barracks—the subject of insults and derision."

The situation of the Livonia WAC was again referred to in a letter to this newspaper from Mrs. Glover. She observed that one of her organization's board members, "the mother of a WAC, described the suffering 'equal rights' have caused her daughter who is billeted in a male barracks, albeit, in a separate room."

The letter added: "The men harass

her to such an extent that even her room allows no privacy; furthermore they have manhandled and propositioned her."

WITH THE ASSISTANCE of her mother, Mrs. Eleanor Jacobs, the Observer & Eccentric was able to contact Specialist Jacobs. She said that since her statement had to be approved by the U.S. Army, she would send a letter.

In her letter, the WAC listed all the accommodations in which she has lived since joining the Army in July 1973 after completing two years of study at Schoolcraft College.

At four of her posts she lived in all-female barracks, she said.

"In October 1974 an Army-wide policy called unit integrity was brought about," she continued. "This program was designed to have all members of a company remain with that company for all phases (housing, finance, personnel, duty etc.) instead of spreading us out to another company."

"This program was also designed to save money. Separate personnel to handle WACs was eliminated, empty barracks space caused by sex restriction was used to house both sexes."

SPECIALIST JACOBS explained that she has been an environmental health technician, but when the engineers do not have a job for her, she is detailed to another section.

"From November 1974 to Jan. 1, 1975 two WACs (myself and one other) lived in an all-male company," she wrote. "We each had a private room with a private bath. However, there were men across the hall, etc."

"During this time I had dreams knocking on my door at 2 a.m. calling

me about the party they had attended, guys knocking on the door asking for matches, change, laundry detergent, soap etc., using these things as an excuse to talk to me."

"After Christmas, the other WAC got married and moved off post with her husband. For the following four months I was the only female living in an all-male barracks. Another WAC joined the company in April 1970."

"At the end of June, 1975, the 36th Engineers moved into the same building as another company, and the female personnel from both companies was put in one end of the building, separate and off limits to the males."

In an interview the Army specialist said, "I don't want to indicate that I was forced at any time to be degraded."

She added: "I had options, some less attractive than others. I am not making a negative statement."

Job entry workshops set by Schoolcraft

Three six-hour workshops designed to train people for specific jobs, or update job skills, will be repeated during September by the women's programs and services department at Schoolcraft College.

The three are Pegboard Office Systems, Orientation to Medical Terminology, and Coding with H-ICDA. Each runs from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and will cost \$15, including books and instructional materials.

All will be held in Room 210 of the Liberal Arts Building on the SC Livonia campus. Advance registration is advised because of enrollment limitations, and this may be done at the cashier's office in the administration building, open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. daily.

The office systems workshop is scheduled Thursday, Sept. 11. It is designed as an orientation of the various medical office procedures using pegboard systems. Topics planned for discussion and practice include use of pegboard systems for payroll, billing, and accounts payable.

On Wednesday, Sept. 18, the medical terminology workshop will deal with common prefixes, stems, and suffixes used in construction of medical terms.

The coding workshop, planned Sept. 25, will cover the coding of medical information, including the classification of diseases and operations.

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OL priest looks to 'more positive, joyous' view of sex

A group of Catholic theologians, headed by the dean of theology at St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary in Orchard Lake, is preparing a study on the church's outlook on human sexuality—a task its chairman insists is long overdue.

However sensational the final report becomes, it won't very likely condone marriage for priests, approve the pill, bless homosexuals or encourage premarital sex. Such sweeping reforms in church teaching won't likely come from this study or any other source within the church for some time, if ever.

The report will, however, touch on all these subjects, contrasting traditional Catholic viewpoints on these frequently taboo subjects with a more modern understanding of them.

"We want to create a more positive, joyous, wholesome outlook toward human sexuality," said Rev. Anthony Kosnik, of St. Cyril, who has spent the past two years with four other committee members examining the church's attitude toward sex and sexuality through the ages.

"I'M CERTAINLY not a conservative, nor am I a flaming radical," he said. "I see value in both sides and believe they can be mediated."

Having said that, Kosnik admitted that he and his colleagues on the committee are in a "no win" situation. Whatever they say about human sex-

uality and needed reforms in church thinking, traditionalists will say they went too far and liberals will say they didn't go far enough.

"Only fools dare to enter into this area and write on it," Kosnik said with a smile. "We can't win."

According to Kosnik, there have apparently been few fools throughout the ages of the Catholic Church since the area of human sexuality has been one where theologians have feared to tread.

Asked if the church has neglected addressing the subject, Kosnik said quickly, "Oh, very much so."

THE CONCEPTION of right and wrong in most things sexual has been largely misunderstood, misrepresented or unspoken in church history, he said. Often the interpretation of this priest or that bishop is taken for Gospel on the subject. Sometimes people are not aware of changes in church teaching, and often it is priests who are unaware themselves or prefer to remain in the dark ages of church thinking and foster this.

"Priests should be better informed," Kosnik said. "There is a lot of ignorance about some of the positive changes that have taken place in the church."

Kosnik pointed to the recent finding of Vatican II, changing classic church thinking that the primary reason for sexual intercourse is procreation. Kosnik said the new approach is more "holistic," seeing procreation as only one of the benefits.

Of course, the church may still have a long way to go, Kosnik added. He pointed to the modern finding of the high incidence of frigidity among married couples, and said that the teachings of Christianity, which have instilled so much sex-related guilt through the years, must share much of the blame.

"WE HAVE to see sexuality as a very positive thing," he said. "A lot of the past approaches have to be rethought and reformulated."

Kosnik's committee has examined human sexuality from Biblical and early cultural understanding of it all the way to the studies of Kinsey and Masters and Johnson.

The final report, which won't be ready for another six months to a year, will provide more than an updated checklist of dos and don'ts. It won't call for a new era of church-blessed sexual freedom.

Many essential values will remain, Kosnik said, but more attention will be given to the circumstance and context of sexual expression.

In the past, he explained, it was held that masturbation was wrong. Period. Now, however, we know the difference between an exploring adolescent or a married man whose wife is unable to have intercourse from (say) one who masturbates in place of creating meaningful relationships with others, he said.

One instance is wrong and the others perhaps not, Kosnik said.

"WE WANT to reduce the false guilt," he said. "There is a certain sense of guilt, however, that should be maintained."

Regardless of possible changes of attitudes to come, certain constants about wholesome sexual expression will remain, he said.

"Every expression of human sexuality should be honest, faithful, other-enriching, socially responsible and joyous. It should be frustrating, exploitative, dishonest, unfaithful, promiscuous or socially irresponsible."

WHEN COMPLETED, the report will be given to the Catholic Theological Society of America, which will then decide when or if it will be published.

Kosnik conceded that the final report, rather than offering quick solutions, may raise more questions than it answers. Perhaps, by scholarly examination of such topics as homosexuality, celibacy, pre-marital sex or birth control, the study may do little more than illustrate how complex these topics are, he said.

That, however, may be enough, he said, because classic church teaching has often held the opposite view: that these matters were simple cases of right or wrong.

"I am opposed to criticizing and ridiculing the past," he said. "But every generation has the task of rethinking the Gospel and applying it to its own day and age."

Bible class to begin new term

The community Bible class taught by Margaret Hess will begin its fall session Tuesday, Sept. 9, from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. in Ward United Presbyterian Church, 17000 Farmington Road, Livonia.

The study in the class this year will cover Isaiah, Jeremiah, Daniel and other Old Testament prophets.

Mrs. Hess's talk for the first session will be on "Renewing Your Strength," from the 40th chapter of the book of Isaiah.

Mrs. Hess seeks to make the Bible come alive by exploring its historical and geographical backgrounds. She also applies its teachings to everyday living.

The class follows a study plan which covers the entire Bible over eight years, and new students can enter at any point.

Study materials for the year cost \$3 and will be available at the first session. Free nursery care for infants and pre-schoolers is provided.

The class was begun by Mrs. Hess with 12 women present, and at the end of last year there were 400 enrolled in groups that met in Livonia and Birmingham. Those attending represented 96 different churches and 17 denominations.

Mrs. Hess, wife of Dr. Bartlett Hess, senior minister at Ward, has been teaching Bible classes for 25 years. She has published many articles, co-authored a book with her husband and makes regular radio broadcasts over station WEXL.

Dr. Gough will speak at services Sunday, Sept. 7, at 10:45 a.m., his topic being "In The Beginning—God."

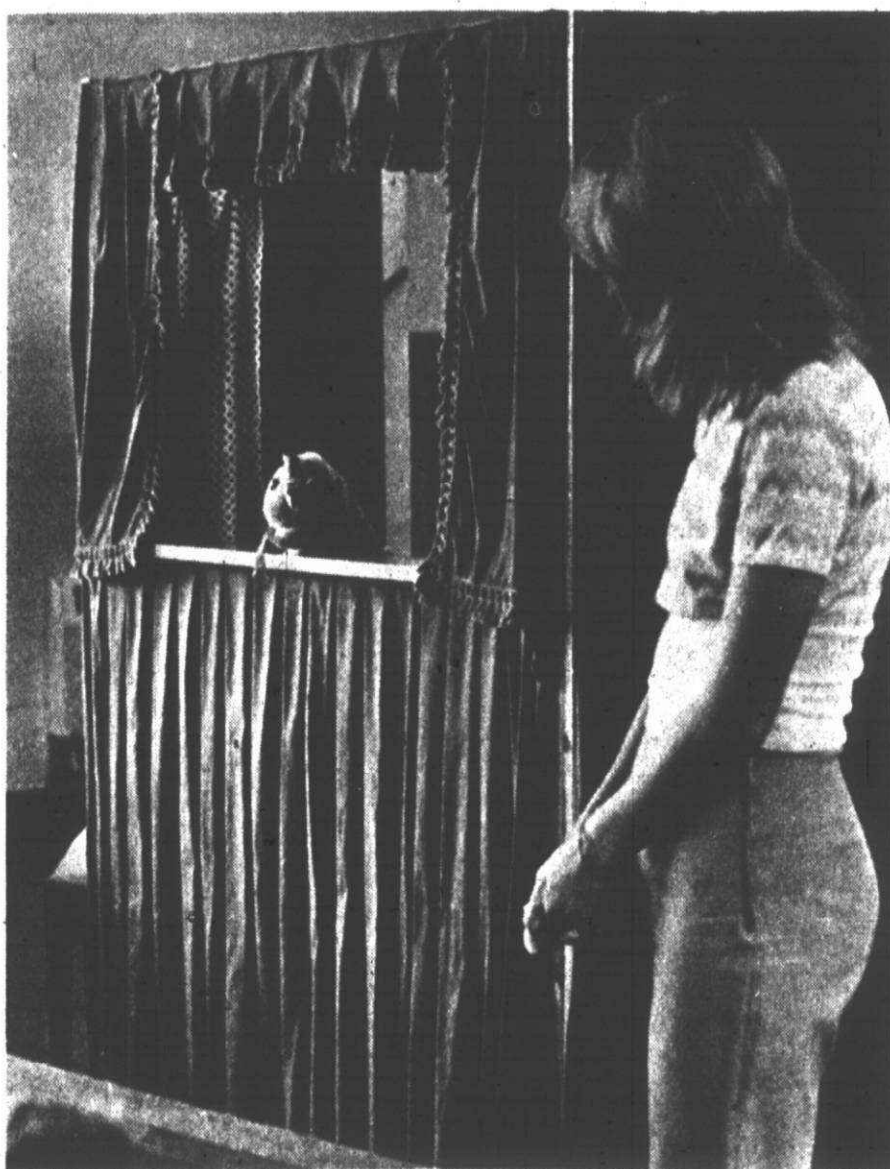

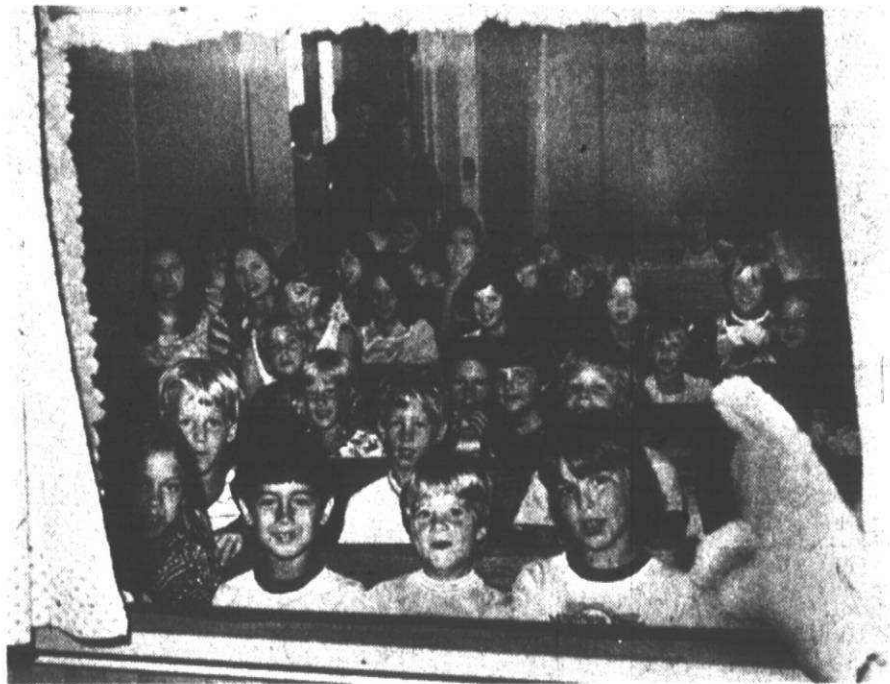

Better planning urged for Hines Drive bike days

Mary E. Dumas, Wayne County Commissioner from Livonia, says she "heartily supports" continuation of bike days along Edward Hines Drive, but wants better coordination in the future.

Mrs. Dumas noted that the board of commissioners has been asked to appropriate \$2,400 to provide traffic control and security for two scheduled Bike-a-thons.

But better coordination on the part of the sponsoring groups could have avoided the expenditure of the funds, she said.

"BIKE-A-THONS are scheduled for Sept. 6 and Oct. 4," she said. "It turns out that many Sheriff's deputies will be taking a promotional exam on one of those days, so the \$2,400 expenditure is needed to pay overtime

to deputies who can be available to keep motorists off the parkway and to patrol the 15-mile bike-a-thon route," she explained.

"If the sponsors had checked in advance, they could have been assisted in picking a different day and the taxpayers would have been saved some money."

Expenditure of the overtime pay was recommended by the board's Public Safety & Judiciary Committee.

But the committee also recommended that "the Wayne County Road Commission and Wayne County Sheriff discuss the security needs and other ramifications of scheduling events in the county parks and make a report to the board of commissioners prior to scheduling such events in the future."

The road commission operates the county park system under authority delegated to it by the County Board of Commissioners.

"I THINK the bike days are a tremendous idea and I heartily support the causes for which they are being held," Mrs. Dumas stated. "But I would like to see the recommendation by the public safety and judiciary committee honored by the Sheriff and the road commission."

"I would like to see future requests for bike days come before the board of commissioners itself, in order to coordinate the efforts of the Sheriff's department with those of the parks division which is funded out of the general county budget. This would prevent any unnecessary expenditure of taxpayers' funds due to conflicting plans."

The \$2,400 overtime outlay was approved tentatively by the commissioners, meeting as the Ways and Means Committee, Aug. 14 and was due for final approval at a board meeting on Aug. 21.

Entertainment bonus

St. Dunstan offers family films at low prices

An entertainment bonus—movies for children, teens and adults and families—is being offered residents of this area by St. Dunstan Catholic Church, 1515 Belton, Garden City, beginning with a big film weekend Sept. 6 and 7. Projectionist Mike Ward, working

on the program under sponsorship of his church and its Parent Teacher Guild, will show the Disney feature "Bedknobs & Broomsticks" with the help of his own bonus from the movies—his fiancée, Kathy Graziotti.

They're advertising their second season of church-sponsored films with posters that said "We're getting married, but the show must go on."

But, while making wedding plans for the big day next April, they are also lining up a season of film dates that include three weekends of films for children, two family films that will be shown three nights each, and three teen and adult films, also scheduled for three showings.

WARD, WHO SERVED as a U.S. Army Special Services and was a projectionist for shows for GIs in Vietnam, decided to try the project in his home community. In the process of asking help with the children's shows he met Kathy last January and proposed before the second season could begin.

But that's getting ahead of the St. Dunstan film scenario. "I'd had plenty of experience with putting on entertainment shows," he said, "and when I got home, I got to thinking about how kids had so few places to go and how expensive it was getting to be when they wanted to see a movie."

A conversation with a neighbor, Glenn Loewe, led to his locating a film distributor, and the church council and pastor, the Rev. Leonard A. Makulski, gave enthusiastic support.

Ward put on his first show, a full-length Disney feature and assorted short subjects, on Nov. 2 and 3 in the parish hall behind the church. A total of 281 children came.

More weekends of entertainment for children followed. Ward scheduled shows Saturdays at 11:30 a.m. and Sundays at 2 p.m.

"Absent-minded Professor," "The

Computer Wore Tennis Shoes" and "Snowball Express" were a few of the movies the kids enjoyed, complete with popcorn a couple of times, from the La Parisienne theater.

THE CHARGE from the beginning has been 50 cents a child. Adults who bring the kids watch the shows free.

"I figure if someone brings several kids and stays with them, that's several kids I don't have to watch," he said.

Ward also has made price adjustments a few times, especially in the cases of families with several children. "I don't want any kid to be left out if others in his neighborhood are coming," he explained.

The shows for children all have more than paid expenses, Ward said, but it hasn't worked out quite as well for the teen and adult show he decided to institute during the year.

"I FIGURED young people don't have the kind of money many theaters charge for entertainment," he said, so we decided to try some shows for them."

These are run Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights "at approximately 7:30—it depends a bit on whether there's a wedding or some other function going on in the church hall," Ward said.

But, although the showbills have included such recent hits as "American Graffiti," "Funny Girl" and "For Pete's Sake," it's been rather rough going to cover the costs of the somewhat expensive rentals.

"We would like it known that these shows are for people all over the

area, not just this parish," Ward said. He added that there's no great aim to make a profit on the films.

"We just want to clear expenses, and whatever there is extra will be used toward getting better films," he explained.

Prices are \$1 for all seats during the evening films.

THE PROGRAM of children's entertainment for the coming year begins this weekend when, in addition to "Bedknobs & Broomsticks," there will be a Disney featurette, "The Three Little Pigs," and a Disney cartoon carnival. As during other children's shows, there will be reasonably-priced refreshments and free coffee for adults.

Coming attractions for children are "Darby O'Gill and the Little People," Oct. 4 and 5, and "Shaggy Dog," Nov. 1 and 2.

Teen and adult night films planned are "The Way We Were," Oct. 17, 18 and 19, "The Sting," Nov. 21, 22 and 23, and "Airport '75," March 19, 20 and 21.

NEW THIS YEAR will be two family nights, when adults will pay 75 cents and children 50 cents for G-rated films. Ward plans to show "Airport" Sept. 19, 20 and 21, and that show will also include an early Halloween surprise feature.

Family nights Jan. 16, 17 and 18 will feature two John Wayne films, "Rio Lobo" and "Big Jake."

One feature tentatively planned has been scratched.

Ward had thought for a time of getting "Funny Lady" for a family night at the end of April.

But he and Kathy are getting married instead. "We're sure," Ward said, "people can wait until next year for 'Funny Lady.'"

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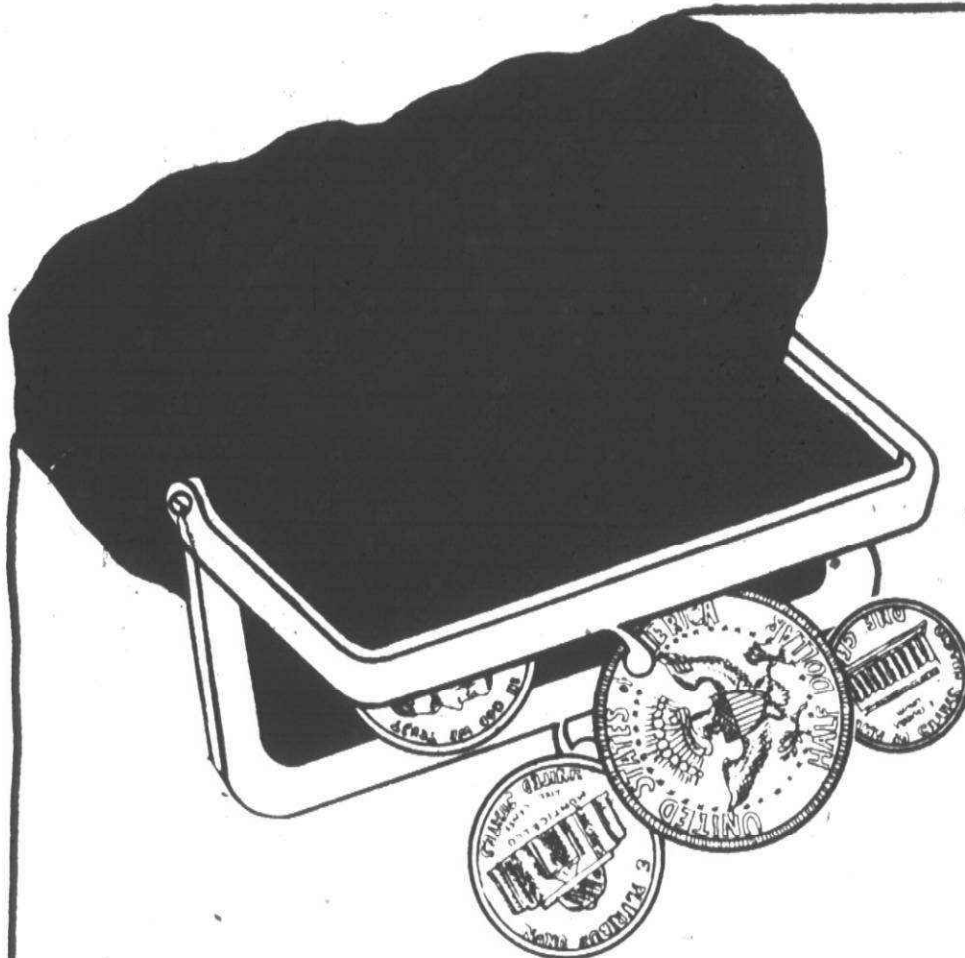
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Nero shares spotlight

Bonefish tops \$40,000 'Matron' field

The super trotting horse Bonefish, winner of the Hambletonian in four gruelling heats over national television last Saturday, and the pacing sensation Nero will provide a climactic 1-2 punch for Grand Circuit harness racing at Wolverine Raceway in Livonia Thursday and Friday nights.

Bonefish, already purchased for \$1 million by Castleton Farm in Kentucky for future stallion duties, will head a field of North America's top trotters in the \$40,000 Matron Stake on Friday. The handsome son of world record holder Nevele Pride will be driven again by Stanley Dancer, the only man who has ever sat in a race sulky behind him.

"How do I rate Bonefish with Nevele Pride, Super Bowl and Su Mac Lad?" Dancer repeated a question asked by a reporter earlier this week. "Well, I drove them all and just let me say I've never sat behind a greater trotter than Bonefish."

Driver Joe O'Brien, who will bring Nero to the starting gate Thursday night at Wolverine in the \$50,000 Matron Stake for 3-year-old pacers, says virtually the same thing about his 1975 Little Brown Jug favorite.

"HE WON 13 OF 14 last year as a 2-year-old and won a dozen or so this year before he was upset in that one race," O'Brien summarizes. "He can give you miles at 1:56 and a piece if he has to: the only time I've ever gone much faster was behind Steady Star."

O'Brien referred to the historic time trial at Lexington, Ky., in 1971 when he covered a mile in a near incredible 1:52 flat with the pacing steady star.

Lining up Thursday night against Nero, as the wonder horse tunes up for the prestigious Little Brown Jug in mid-September, will be the one colt who was able to whip him last year,

Castleton Farm's Alert Bret. That defeat of Nero came in October in the International Stallion Stake at Lexington, and Castleton driver Glen Ramsey had to push Alert Bret to a record 1:55.4 mile to get the job done.

Other Jug-bound pacers who'll take a Wolverine swing at Nero Thursday include George Sholty's Truxon Hanover, Bill Haughton's Brets Champ, Dick Farrington's All Time Bret, Buddy Gilmore's Senor Duane, Bill Popfinger's Shirleys Beau and an O'Brien-trained speedster named Bo Bo Arrow.

Nero's challengers received somewhat disheartening news on Tuesday when his trainer Jim Crane advised Wolverine officials that an aggravating corn on one of his front feet has been removed and is not healed. The ailment was disturbing enough to the great Meadow Skipper colt that he has been held off the race track for the past three weeks.

"We're flying him in from Canada to Wolverine today," Crane said Tuesday. "He's completely recovered, 100 per cent sound and rearin' to go."

DANCER REPORTED on Monday that Bonefish likewise is at his peak and showing no fatigue at all from his marathon performance in the Hambletonian. Track officials visiting his stall on Tuesday readily confirmed Dancer's report as the big colt nipped playfully at his handlers, greeted all observers with ears on high and ate heartily of the hay which was shipped in specially for him.

"He's a powerful animal," Stanley pointed out. "And one of the biggest horses I have ever handled. In that fourth heat of the Hambletonian when Yankee Bambino was giving us so much heat I looked down and saw

that our sulky wheels were exactly even with his. I knew then we had won because Bonefish is at least a foot longer than most other horses."

A new track trotting record could very easily come at the end of the Bonefish mile at Wolverine on Friday.

Grandpa Jim set the present one of 1:59.2 back in 1971 and with other trotters such as Surefire Hanover, Noble Rogue, Fashion Blaze and Glasgow ready to push Bonefish over the swift Wolverine mile track current records might not be worth a dime a dozen.

GC West trains sights on Tri-River grid title

Make no mistake about it, Garden City West looks like the 'team to beat' in the Tri-River League this year.

Coach Charley Elmquist's Tigers tied for the Tri-River championship last year with a 6-1 record, finished 6-3 overall, and have 12 starters returning. In addition, they have 26 lettermen back and most of them saw action in Elmquist's 'play as many as possible' philosophy.

In his first season as head coach last year, Elmquist used 21 starters on his offensive and defensive units and hopes to do the same this year.

"Playing that many boys builds an enthusiasm and team spirit that you can't imagine," says Elmquist, who spent four years as assistant coach at West before being named head man last fall. "I definitely feel this could be a big year for us, but it hinges on so many things," he points out. "We have the players with the ability, but they have got to really want to win and play hard and keep that 'closeness' we had as a team last year."

The Tigers are blessed with a rugged defense, a versatile offense and hope to add the passing game which was missing most of last year.

POWERING WEST'S offense are five returning linemen, including tackles Matt Shinsky (5-9, 152 pounds) and Tom Burton (5-11, 174), and guards Jeff Rutter (5-10, 205) and Steve Pniewski (5-10, 175). Senior Pat McGahan (6-1, 175), a talented receiver, and 6-1, 185 pound Wayne Hard, a good blocker, will be the ends. Fighting for the center position are regular linebacker Mark Chidester (5-11, 180), Ken Jean (5-11, 175), a second-string tackle and junior Keith Gramke, who did a good job on the JV last year.

Carrying the ball for the Tigers in the backfield will be a pair of fast, powerful runners in Bill Underwood and Terry Bradley. Both halfbacks gained more than 600 yards last year. Underwood gaining his amount in five games before an ankle injury sidelined him the last four games.

Bradley (5-10, 170) was moved from slotback to tailback to replace Underwood (5-7, 180) the last four games and rolled up 534 yards and scored six touchdowns in that span which earned him all-league and second team all-area honors.

"I don't know of a team in the state that wouldn't like to have Bill and Terry in their backfield," Elmquist said. And the head coach is also very high on junior Greg Shinsky. "He's just a super guy to have playing full-back to block, carry the ball or go out for passes."

FIELD GENERAL for the Tiger machine will be quarterback Tom Poole, who possesses a strong left arm as well as adding the sprint out option to the West attack. The slender senior (6-4, 165) was backup last year on the varsity after guiding the JV squad to a 6-3 record and once threw four touchdown passes in one half. He could complement Shinsky (6-1, 185), Bradley and Underwood very well in the backfield.

No team scored more than twice against West's defense except Garden City East.

"I think our defense will be the key to our success this year," Elmquist says. "Then if our offense can grind out the yardage, we'll control the ball."

Anchoring the defensive wall will be Senior Steve Wilmoth, an end who stands 6-2 and weighs only 155, but is very hard to block. The other end will be Tom Parks (6-1, 175), the tackles are Ken Schwaegerle (6-2, 185) and John McFadden (6-2, 180) and nose-man is 5-7, 165 pound Jeff Peltz, who is also second string halfback and once scored four touchdowns in a JV game.

In the Tigers' 5-2 defense, brothers Matt and Greg Shinsky will alternate as left linebacker while Mark Chidester will back up the right side.

Versatile Senior John Stuppra (5-10, 180), who can play just about any position, returns to his right cornerback spot. His pass interception in the Tri-River title game with Southgate iced the game for West.

Bob Samples, probably the smallest player on the team at 5-9, 145, was a regular split end last year and the all-around athlete will return to defensive left halfback where he played two years ago on the JV team. Dale Stuppra, a 6-foot, 165 pound junior, will join his brother, John, in the defensive backfield. The fourth secondary position, called Tiger man on West's team, is currently held by Mark Downey, a 5-8, 155 pound junior.

"We play a containment type defense," Elmquist says, "trying to stop the big play. The big play hurt us last year and we're working hard in stopping it this year."

"We open against John Glenn at home and it is going to be a very tough game. They have a fine coaching staff and that game will go a long way in showing what kind of season we'll have."

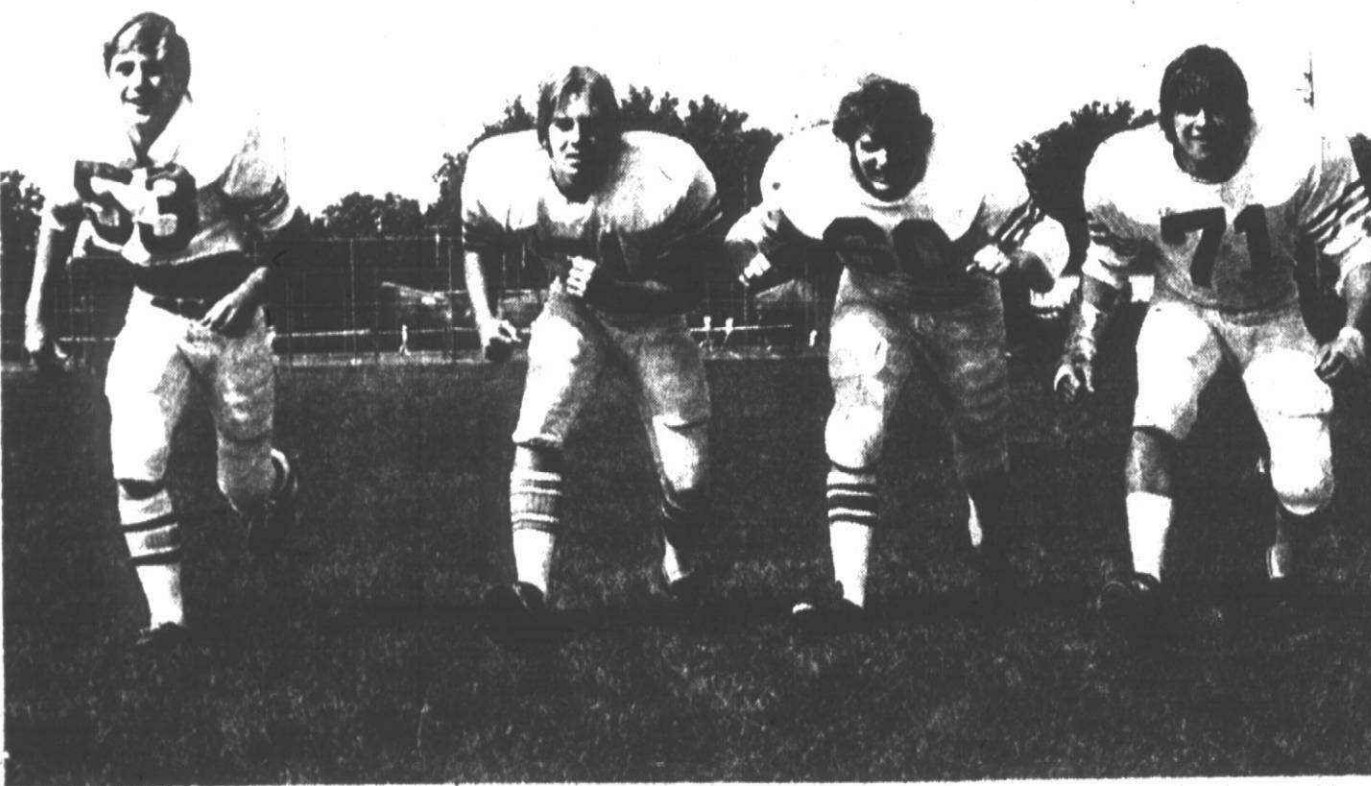
Sectional win keeps Snyder chances alive

All-Sports crown is won by Salem

(Ed. Note: The following article is an excerpt from a column by Bill Frank, sports editor of the Battle Creek Enquirer & News, who is the unofficial statistician among state sports writers of state championship high school results.)

There's a break in the action for state Class A All-Sports honors in the prep ranks.

Plymouth Salem is the 1974-75 All-Sports champion, based on the final state standings in nine popular sports.

By winning, Salem broke a nine-year grip that Seven-A and South Central Conference schools had on the state honors.

As you know, we began to figure Class A All-Sports champions 10 years ago on a point basis. We award 10 points to a state champion, followed by 9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 for the remaining top 10 in each sport.

In the first nine years of the compilations, Seven-A member schools won seven state titles and SCC members took the other two. Ann Arbor Pioneer of the 7-A captured five of the championships.

Plymouth Salem's breakthrough this school year is a real surprise. Most fans know little or nothing about the school that is located about 30 miles east of Ann Arbor. No daily paper covers Salem's athletic activities.

Nevertheless, Salem amassed 23.5 points in state competition to wind up

the big All-Sports winner. The school won the Class A baseball title for 10 points, tied for third in basketball and finished fifth in football (final AP poll) for six points.

WE ARE PROUD of our athletic program and our teams," said John Sandmann, athletic director at Salem for 27 years. "We're also happy to learn that we are the state All-Sports champion."

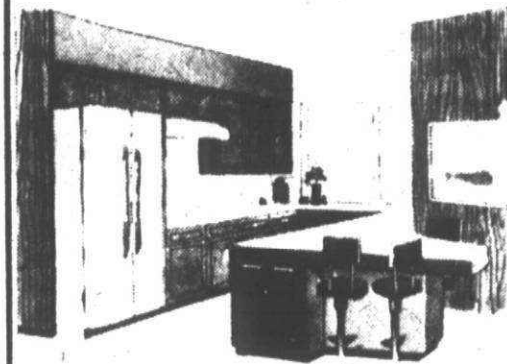
Sandmann explained that Plymouth has two Class A high schools, Salem and Canton. He said Canton is the newer school, graduating its first senior class this year. When Canton came into existence, the name of the older Plymouth High School was changed to Plymouth Salem.

Salem is a member of the Suburban Eight League that includes Trenton, Dearborn, Belleville, Edsel Ford, Redford Union, Livonia Bentley and Allen Park. Incidentally, Dearborn finished ninth in the All-Sports race on 12.5 points.

Salem nosed out Birmingham Brother Rice for All-Sports honors. Brother Rice, a fourth place finisher a year ago, moved up to the runner-up spot on 22.5 points.

Seven-A schools landed three members in the top 10, headed by Jackson Central which finished in a tie for fourth place with Flint Northwestern. Ypsilanti wound up eighth and Ann Arbor Pioneer finished 10th.

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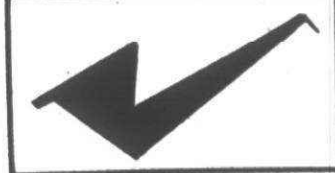
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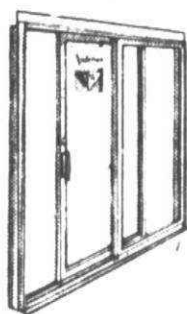
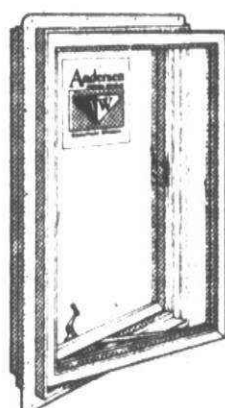

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O&E tourney record may fall

Although now in its seventh full season as an 18-hole golf mecca, the Whispering Willows course in Livonia never has been subjected to such a massive attack by top-flight golfers as is in store during the 1975 Observer & Eccentric tournament.

The annual 36-hole men's tourney is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 13 and 14, while the women's 18-hole event is booked for Thursday, Sept. 18. Medal play will govern throughout.

Whispering Willows Pro Gary Whitener forecast this week that the overall quality of the record field will pose a real threat to the O&E Tournament record of 67-73-140 set by Livonia's Bud Stevens in 1972.

"Not only are entries running well ahead of last year, but the out-of-town response has been tremendous," said Whitener. "This includes many golf-

ers from points such as Bloomfield Hills and the Rochester area as well as Farmington and Southfield. "Stevens will be on hand trying for his third O&E title, but typical of the class of competition will be Johnny Johnson, who won this year's club championship at Bay Pointe and last weekend teamed to win the Plum Hollow Invitational."

Whitener emphasized that the deadline for filing entry blanks for the men's tourney is Wednesday, Sept. 10. Women's entries will close Tuesday, Sept. 16. In case rain wipes out any round of either event, makeup dates have been arranged.

"The course will play to a par of 71 at about 6,450 yards and is a very good test of golf," said Whitener. "It is in excellent condition after the recent rains and has a great variety of

challenges that make a golfer use every club in the bag.

"The toughest back-to-back holes probably are the 11th and 12th, both par four. The 11th is 400 yards through the woods and over a creek, while the 435-yard 12th has a slight dogleg where it takes two good shots to get home.

"Anyone who gets through those two in par has the back nine about whipped."

Not only is Stevens' 36-hole score of 140 the tournament record, but that 67 which he shot in the 1972 event stands as the best competitive mark ever recorded at Whispering Willows—taking precedence over a non-tournament 65

Atkins says RU is 'unknown quantity'

With 22 underclassmen on a 36-man squad, only three returning starters and nobody on the team tipping the scales at the 200-pound mark, the temptation exists for Redford Union football coach Bob Atkins to write this year off as one for "rebuilding."

"I hate that word. I really do," said the Panther coach, however.

Steve Zink, junior co-captain, started every game last year at both center and linebacker. The 6-2, 190-pound Zink may be switched from center to a guard spot this year, but in any case will be asked to make a vital contribution.

Handling the quarterbacking duties

will be junior Mike Watson. Last season, Watson saw action at split end and safety. At 5-8, 145, Watson is small but he has the arm and quickness to handle the show.

The entire team, in fact, will have to be quick if it is to be competitive.

"We'd better be quick this year. We'll just have to finesse people and execute," said Atkins, who is entering his 18th year in a coaching capacity at RU.

Newcomer Paul Shileikas, who will play both guard and linebacker, will be expected to help out the veterans.

"He looks like a tough football player," Atkins said of the 6-0, 185 Shileikas. Junior Randy Wahlstrom is another fresh face from whom big things are expected.

While Atkins hopes to be competitive in every game, his goal for the year is a reachable one.

"We just want to have a winning season," he said.

He sees Trenton as the top team in the Suburban Eight, but looks for any number of teams to challenge.

"Trenton has to be the number one team though. They have a lot of quality people back."

For his own team's chances, Atkins has a simple approach.

"We don't have the big strong kid. We're just going to have to fight like hell," he said.
