

Suburbs may sue over water rate hike

Representatives of 65 suburban communities Monday pledged full support of any legal action needed to stop a 39 per cent rate hike ordered by the Detroit Metropolitan Water Board due to take effect May 1.

The suburban officials met in Livonia at the invitation of Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara to map a strategy against the rate hike which McNamara has branded "arbitrary and capricious...and absolutely unnecessary at this time."

The group unanimously elected McNamara chairman of a steering committee and empowered him to select 10 members from the coalition to serve on a committee that will determine what legal steps to

take to stop the Detroit water board and the costs involved.

In the meantime, representatives will follow up Monday's action with identically worded supportive resolutions from their respective communities. The resolutions will include a financial pledge of five cents per person, based on the 1970 census, in the event the steering committee decides court action is necessary.

All the communities were urged to attend the Feb. 24 public hearing in Detroit set by the Detroit water board at which time the rate schedule reportedly will be explained.

McNamara urged a "concerted effort" to force Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and water department officials to explain

the need for the rate hike when a balanced budget was passed by the water board for this fiscal year requiring no rate increase.

At one point McNamara told the capacity audience in the Livonia Senior Citizens' Center: "Most communities can get along without phones or electricity, but water is an absolute necessity. We're at the mercy of one man—and if he decides to reduce pressure, he can do it."

In his opening remarks, McNamara outlined other options open to the group besides legal action.

One of the strongest, he said, was direct communication with the nine-member Detroit City Council who must approve the rate hike, according to a recent opinion from the attorney general's office.

"Make your feelings known," urged McNamara. "As council members, they must be able to justify the rate hike to their own constituents."

The rate hike, expected to generate \$14-million, applies to Detroiters as well as suburban users, McNamara noted, and many Detroiters are not fully aware of this.

The fact that the Detroit council has not approved the rate hike could be important in delaying the hike—or in possibly halting the increase altogether, McNamara said.

McNamara also outlined pending state legislation, but held out little hope for its passage before the rate increase takes effect because "it's effectively bottlenecked

in committee by the Detroit interest groups."

While the suburban officials agreed legislation would help in the future, they were unanimous in their support of immediate court action to force the water board to prove it needs the increase.

"This group makes up two-thirds of Detroit's customers. Let's make them put the rate increase facts on the table," commented one suburban official.

Officials from Flint, the single largest water customer, reported their efforts to get rate procedure information from the water department have been ignored.

"We wrote for rate study facts and our letters went unanswered. We telephoned

and our phone calls were never returned," said one Flint official.

McNamara offered a mild defense. He said he felt the water department wasn't intentionally ignoring the inquiries, but were doing so "because they simply don't have the answers."

It was his guess, McNamara said, that the water department really doesn't have a rate-making procedure like Detroit Edison or Michigan Bell. The department has sold water so cheaply and easily for so many years that they didn't need any, he added.

Of the water department's new director, Charles Scales, McNamara said, "He has very little knowledge about finances."

Board hires negotiator amid heated discussion

By a vote of 5-2, the Canton Township board approved Edward V. Ott, of the Southfield legal firm of Goldstone and Ott, as its negotiator for three union contracts.

The appointment of Ott, who has been involved in labor talks for more than 30 years, sparked heavy debate between board members.

Ott will negotiate contracts with the DPW employees, the building inspectors and the firefighters, all of whom have been bargaining with township administrators for the past year, and in the case of the DPW, the past two years.

The recommendation to hire Ott, who has served as head of labor relations for Packard Motor Company, Ford Motor Company and Allied Products, was made by an interviewing committee composed of Supervisor Robert Greenstein, Treasurer Carl Parsell, and Clerk John Flodin.

They voted in favor of his appointment, to begin immediately, along with trustees Jim Poole and Jerry Cheske, while Trustee Bob Myers and Brian Schwall opposed the selection for different reasons.

GREENSTEIN, in making the recommendation for the administration, commented, "We have checked with everyone and we had a substantial number of applicants, all of whom were qualified one way or another."

"We had two personal interviews and we were presented with a smattering of lawyers with different reputations."

"We selected Mr. Ott because of his age; he's been a labor lawyer since 1937, and because he's a settled, learned gentleman. He conducts himself with calm and dignity."

"Some of the other lawyers had hard-nose reputations and while they may be needed for later contracts, we wanted someone for the first contract with our employees who would not alienate them."

Terms of the hiring were a \$125 retainer plus \$50 an hour and \$75 an hour if binding arbitration should be necessary.

Original terms of employment considered by the board had been an annual retainer of no more than \$8,000, but Greenstein rejected that idea after investigating the matter.

"Everyone we have talked to suggested we do it on an hourly basis, including Mr. Ott."

"He said that if we had a quick settlement he would find it hard to ask the township board for \$8,000 and he refused to do the job on an annual retainer."

"If you trust the man you hire, you can not expect him to drag out the talks to make his fee."

Greenstein's recommendation of Ott was met with a motion by Myers to table the matter for further consideration, and it failed 5-2 with Myers and Schwall dissenting.

BUT THE MOVE started heated debate between the administration. Myers, Schwall and Poole.

"Why are we trying to stop this now," asked Parsell. "It's imperative we get negotiations under way as soon as possible—why tabled for two weeks?"

"I'm curious that the board wasn't presented with other resumes. I can't attest to the other applicants but I know of one with far superior credentials, and experience. Your man is a former assistant labor lawyer for Westland, the man I know (former Democratic candidate for 2nd congressional district Ron Egnor) negotiated contracts for Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti."

Greenstein commented, "I'm not surprised by anything you do Mr. Myers, but I am astounded by Mr. Schwall's actions."

"Mr. Schwall sat at the table and told us we might get hit with an unfair labor practices complaint unless we moved ahead immediately. Now he's telling us he wants to wait."

"I know of Mr. Myers' friend and he's a tiger. He brought Ann Arbor to its knees, threatening to fire every policeman and bring in men from Detroit."

"We want these talks to be friendly. We don't want a slasher. Maybe later, but right now we'd prefer to try the gentler way. You don't bring in a howitzer to start."

Greenstein added that he never knew of Ott before starting the search for a professional negotiator.

MYERS RESPONDED that Egnor was Jaycee "Man of the year" for the state of Michigan and was a good choice.

Parsell rejoined, "We're not hiring the man of the year, we're hiring a labor negotiator."

Myers said, "Well if you're talking about qualifications, I can't see how you can think the Detroit College of Law is a good background (Ott's alma mater)."

Schwall stepped in commenting, "I don't know the man you refer to as Bob's friend, Mr. Supervisor, or the man who is or is

not your friend, but what I do know is that when we first agreed to hire a man it was an annual retainer and now we're hiring a man who's dictating the terms to us. He says he won't work on an annual basis."

Parsell objected to Schwall and Myers unwillingness to accept Ott.

"We followed the correct procedure," he said. "The board selected people to go out and investigate and spend time on the matter and to move at god speed and now there's a delay. Something is going on here and it certainly is an insult to us."

Greenstein concurred, "It's ridiculous and an insult."

"We spend all this time investigating the guy, and now Myers wants his buddy, and Poole and Schwall want to delay it. If there is an unfair labor practice charge against the township, it's on you."

After the vote to accept Ott, board members agreed that more information should be supplied the trustees after the interview.

But it was suggested that the ground rules for such information be made in advance of the interviewing process.

Officials insure against suits

Much publicity has been given to the problem of medical malpractice insurance in past months—but another kind of insurance, for city and township governments, is becoming more and more common, according to Canton and Plymouth officials.

In Canton Township last July, the township board took out legal liability insurance for all employees of the township, including every member of the board of trustees.

The insurance covers each employee and board member for up to \$2 million in case of a civil suit against either the township as a whole or the individual employee.

COST OF THE premium, from Celina Mutual Insurance of Ohio is about \$1,600 annually.

"I suggested it to the administration," said Trustee Jim Poole. "I think we should do what's been done elsewhere. We should protect ourselves."

"Some of the things that have been done and said in the past might well be illegal."

"Anytime a board member makes an arbitrary or capricious comment, he subjects himself to lawsuits—and I think some lawsuits we might lose."

"I think on occasion some of the board has been way out in left field, inviting lawsuits."

"It's a difficult area," commented Clerk

John Flodin, "but I think getting the insurance was done in good conscience."

Supervisor Robert Greenstein agreed. "It's a common practice in city government. There has to be some protection for the board for their public actions. Someone can sue each member individually for board actions."

Although Plymouth Township officials don't have the same protection, it was once given considerable thought.

"LAST TIME WE checked, we looked all over, but insurance wasn't available," explained Supervisor J.D. McLaren.

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New schools spark debate

want only open classrooms but wanted a mixture of both approaches within a single school building.

DURING THE citizens' portion of the meeting, Mrs. Suzanne Berry of Canton said she has had exposure to both the open classroom at Miller Elementary and the structured situation at Allen Elementary and found the structured approach better for her child.

She urged the board to provide a structured system at the new schools with open classrooms available as an option.

Marda Benson, board president, and Marcia Borowski both said they were firm believers in offering options for parents and didn't support schools with only open classrooms.

TOM GRIFFIN of Canton read a letter signed by parents asking for individualized instruction at the new schools and said he wants the district to seek community input on instructional methods.

The letter appealed for a blending of all

educational philosophies as needed to meet the needs of individual children. "I am aware of the problems at Miller and I'm sure schools and of the successes at Gallimore, Smith, Allen and others. I would hope the board learns from its mistakes and learns from its successes."

After reading the letter asking for a blend of approaches, however, Griffin made some individual comments which included his feeling that there is serious concern among parents in the district that the open school philosophy doesn't work.

"I urge that we return to a basic tradition of educational philosophy. It just doesn't work to allow a seven or eight-year-old free reign in a school."

Another mother spoke up and said it wasn't an issue of open versus traditional. "There will be 500 students in one building and you cannot be so individualized that you will offer 500 options. We'd like to know what the basic idea of education at the new schools will be. I'm not opposed to

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MASTER LAND USE PLAN: PART 3

Industry needed for sound tax base

Editor's note: Part three, today's feature on the master land-use plan takes an in-depth look at the need for business and industry in Canton and what provisions are made under the proposed plan to insure the township will have a balanced tax base. On Monday, the Observer & Eccentric will present an interview with Robert Hotelling, a well known professor of planning at Michigan State University. Hotelling was asked for an outside expert opinion on the plan by township officials.

Half the key to providing township residents with good schools and municipal services at a reasonable price is control of residential growth—a concerted effort by planners to make sure expansion is paced and orderly.

The new master land-use plan makes provisions for controlled growth by zoning most land west of Canton Center agricultural, and by reducing the proposed densities of the eastern, urbanized portion of the township.

But the other half of the equation, and perhaps the more important, is making sure the township has a healthy, balanced tax base—one that generates more than residential tax dollars.

The township's proposed master land-use plan is vitally concerned with making sure there are provisions for business and industry to locate in Canton, says its architect, planner Mike Manore.

"VERY FEW communities can afford the luxury of not having industry. Areas like Grosse Pointe, or Bloomfield Hills don't encourage industry to locate there because the residents are affluent enough to pay for their services."

"But few communities the size of Canton can afford not to have industry. Canton cannot rely on its own residential tax dollars to provide the services people want," Manore explained.

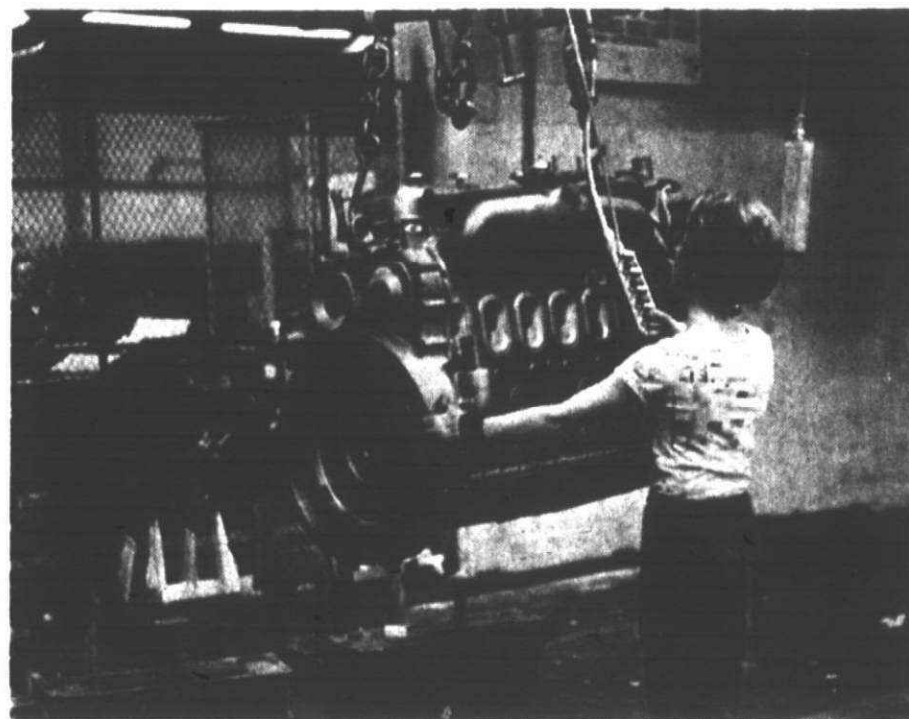
According to Manore, most planning theory today says at least one-third of a community's tax revenue should come from non-residential sources, business and industry.

Presently, Canton is in the ballpark, Manore said, with a non-residential tax base of 37.9 per cent.

But he warned that as the residential sector of the township grows, officials must make sure that commercial and industrial growth keep pace.

"Commercial development—and there are many kinds from the corner drugstore

Procedure debated

Principal named for new school

Ron South has been named principal of the Eriksson Elementary School due to open this fall in Canton Township. South was approved for the position by the Plymouth Board of Education by a 5-2 vote Monday night following a heated debate on the procedure used for nomination. The board had already approved the appointments of Kathryn Otto as principal of Hulsing Elementary and of Larry Miller as principal of Field Elementary, the other two elementary schools under construction. SOUTH HAS served as principal at both Tanger and Fiegel elementary schools in the Plymouth Community School District. He presently serves as principal at Fiegel. South was nominated by Supt. John M. Hoben who spoke highly of his qualifications. "The first open classroom in this district was put in at Tanger School by Ron South," Hoben says, "and he has very good administrative abilities in knowing how to deal with the public. I consider him one of the best principals in the district." E.J. McClendon, who made the motion to approve South's appointment, said he

felt the choice was a very good one and he was proud to support the nomination. His sentiments were echoed by trustee Joe Gray. Marcia Borowski, in voting against the appointment, explained her vote had nothing to do with South as a person but the procedure followed in making the appointment. "I'd rather we hold back on this to examine and discuss it further. This was sprung on us at the last minute without sufficient information to make a rationale decision." Marda Benson, board president, agreed that the board hadn't been given enough information. "It is critical that the principal be one with abilities in all phases of education, one who can work with the community and can excel in educational leadership." George Lawton disagreed, stating the board had enough information for the other two appointments and had months to consider the third. "There is not a better qualified or motivated administrator in this district than Ron South." Ms. Benson then quoted from the minutes of the June 23 board meeting which indicated the board, by a unanimous vote, established a screening committee which was directed to receive applications, screen and interview candidates, and make a recommendation to the board. "What has happened to the screening process of the committee and where is the committee's recommendation to the board? All we have is the superintendent's recommendation and that runs against the direction given by this board." That committee consisted of trustees Tom Yack, Gary Minto, Deputy Supt. Earl Hogan, George Dotson, principal of Gallimore Elementary, and two teachers.

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In budget session

Geer School spared by board of trustees

Geer School will remain open until at least the fall of 1976.

That decision was made Monday night by the Plymouth Board of Education after a cost analysis convinced the board that the money saved wasn't high enough to justify closing the two-room school building.

Originally, the administration had projected a savings of \$4,000 if Geer were closed, but the analysis given the board Monday indicated the actual savings only would be about \$2,000.

INSTRUMENTAL in the decision to keep Geer School open was money and volunteer time pledged by parents of children attending Geer.

The Geer PTA has promised to provide the money to provide insulation and storm doors and windows to reduce heating expenses.

Parents also have volunteered to serve as teacher aides without pay and to handle custodial work on weekends. The money saved in pay to teacher aides amounts to about \$600 for the balance of the school

year, and a reduction in custodial hours from 18 to 10 per week amounts to a savings of about \$800 for the remainder of the school year.

Ray Hoedell, assistant superintendent for business, estimates it would cost about \$700 to close down Geer School and there would be an additional expense if the decision was made to re-open Geer next fall.

The decision to keep Geer open was by a 6-0 vote of the board with E.J. McClendon abstaining. In explaining his vote, McClendon said: "Geer School does represent an excellent adventure in education and I'm not in favor of closing it. But keeping the school open won't help us balance our budget."

"This board, and parents in the district, must face up to the reality that because of our financial condition our children cannot get the same quality education they have in the past."

Because of the district's financial plight, the board voted 7-0 to approve a motion made by George Lawton to establish an ad

hoc committee to meet on a high priority time basis to better consider budget options on a continuing basis.

The committee will consist of the board treasurer, Hoedell, and three others to be named by Board President Marda Benson. The district's auditor is expected to be a member of the committee.

That committee is expected to make a recommendation at the next board meeting on whether a freeze ought to be placed on all spending in the district in instructional building accounts. A 25 per cent freeze is in effect now.

The board may also reconsider at its next meeting a recommendation to trim expenses by reassigning eight reading specialists. This item had been tabled until the teachers union, Plymouth Education Association, had a chance to vote on suggested reductions which could save about \$35,000. The PEA membership, however, recently voted down these proposals and the board is expected now to reconsider reassigning the reading teachers.

Water suit discussed by suburban officials

The Livonia mayor, who served on the water board until he was fired in October after questioning the rate hike, blasted some items in the water department budget.

"For instance," he said, "\$35,000 goes to the mayor's office. I don't know of one service we got from him—except to fire me."

McNamara also was critical of 102 new jobs that appear in the budget. Fifty-two

of those are for the water department, McNamara said, and 46 of those are administrative posts assigned to the director's staff.

McNamara also charged that the construction of the Port Huron facility "was

never necessary and will only be used four months of the year."

Many communities explained the hardship the rate increase would be on their residents.

Clio city officials, for instance, explained that it buys water from Genesee County, who in turn buys from the City of Flint, who buys it from Detroit.

"The way it's going, pretty soon it will be cheaper to buy water in bottles off the grocer's shelves than from the pipes," a Clio official said.

McNamara said he will begin immediately sifting through committee possibilities and would communicate the committee's progress through a letter. A date for a second meeting will depend on the committee's progress.

McNamara took a verbal potshot at Mayor Young's statements that the Livonia mayor was only raising objections to the rate hike because he wanted headlines

to help him run for the second district U.S. Congressional seat.

"Not only am I not a candidate for Congress," quipped McNamara, "I'm not a candidate for chairman of this meeting, if someone else wants to take over."

From the outset of the meeting, however, it was obvious that the Livonia mayor was the unanimous choice of all the communities to lead the protest.

to regional shopping centers—is a market function.

"Businessmen see an area grow and they realize there is a market for them," Manore said.

Because business location to Canton is a market function, and because Canton's population and disposable income are climbing steadily, Manore said attracting commercial tax base should not be much of a problem for the township.

"What we have to look out for is strip zoning," he said. "That will be the biggest fight because there will be many requests for strip zoning. There always are."

Manore added that strip zoning presents traffic hazards and aesthetic problems, particularly in the area of signs.

BUT UNLIKE commercial growth, which is expected to follow in the footsteps of more residential development, attracting industry may be a problem for Canton. "Industry is a different story," explained the planner. "Virtually every community looks at industry as a tax plus, and the competition is tremendous. Thousands of acres in many communities have been zoned industrial and industrialists really have a pick as to where they can move."

"What is needed is someone to sell the community to attract industry."

Manore said industrial zones cannot be created in an area unless certain conditions exist.

"Basically, you have to take what you have and take advantage of it."

"Industry wants class A roads—roads with no weight limits—that can be used by trucks year round. They want natural gas, railroads, sewers, and airports."

Following those guidelines, the proposed master land-use plan has allocated 2,470 acres for industry, or 10.6 per cent of the township's land.

Industrial uses have been specified for a wedge of land between Michigan Avenue and the Penn Central railroad in southeast Canton, and along the Chesapeake and Ohio corridor in northeast Canton.

"**THERE HAS** been an historical growth in the region where industry has followed the lines of transportation, and those two locations are areas that provide the necessary transportation, and have attracted industry in neighboring communities along the same corridor in the past," Manse said.

Industrial zones have been divided into two categories, light and heavy, the major difference lying with the nuisance factor a plant would present.

Those that would more likely be a nuisance to residents, in terms of noise, smell, traffic congestion and smoke, would be considered heavy industry.

Heavy industry is designated only for the Michigan Avenue corridor, while only light industry will be allowed in the Chesapeake and Ohio corridor, located near Joy and Haggerty.

A warehousing operation like Kresge's is a good example of light industry," Manore explained. "It doesn't provide much of a nuisance to residents."

"Much of planning is buffering or step-down zoning. 'You don't want your heavy industry to be next to residential.'"

Manore said the prospects of Canton's attracting industry in the future looked healthy.

"I think natural gas is the biggest selling point Canton has. We are serviced by Consolidated and they have gas available. To the east and north, communities are serviced by Consumer's, and they can't guarantee gas to new industrial customers."

"I think Van Buren will be our strongest competitor because they also have Consolidated."

Manore said another strong selling point for Canton is that it has provisions for all kinds of housing—housing necessary for the employees that both commercial and industrial growth would attract.

WHILE MUCH land has been set aside for industry, only 5.3 per cent of Canton's land has been allocated for commercial usage.

"We tried to get away from over-zoning," explained Supervisor Robert Greenstein. "That's tantamount to a written guarantee that anyone thinking about doing business in Canton won't be in a position of investing heavily in a building and property and then be faced with the prospect of shutting down because of too much competition."

"Businessmen coming here want to know they have a good chance of making it and I can't think of anything worse than a township full of boarded up stores."

"I think Canton is attractive enough that it doesn't have to prostitute itself or its resources to get enough business. Bigger is not always better, and I think, ultimately, we will have the right mix of business."

While provisions have been made for commercial establishments, in many locations and of almost every type from office buildings and the neighborhood market to the large community centers like Meijer's and Kmart's, no land has been set aside for regional shopping.

Although plans for a vast complex like Wonderland in Livonia or Briarwood in Ann Arbor were once provided in the original Mocerri plan for land located at Sheldon and Joy, all such notions of a regional complex have been scratched for the time being.

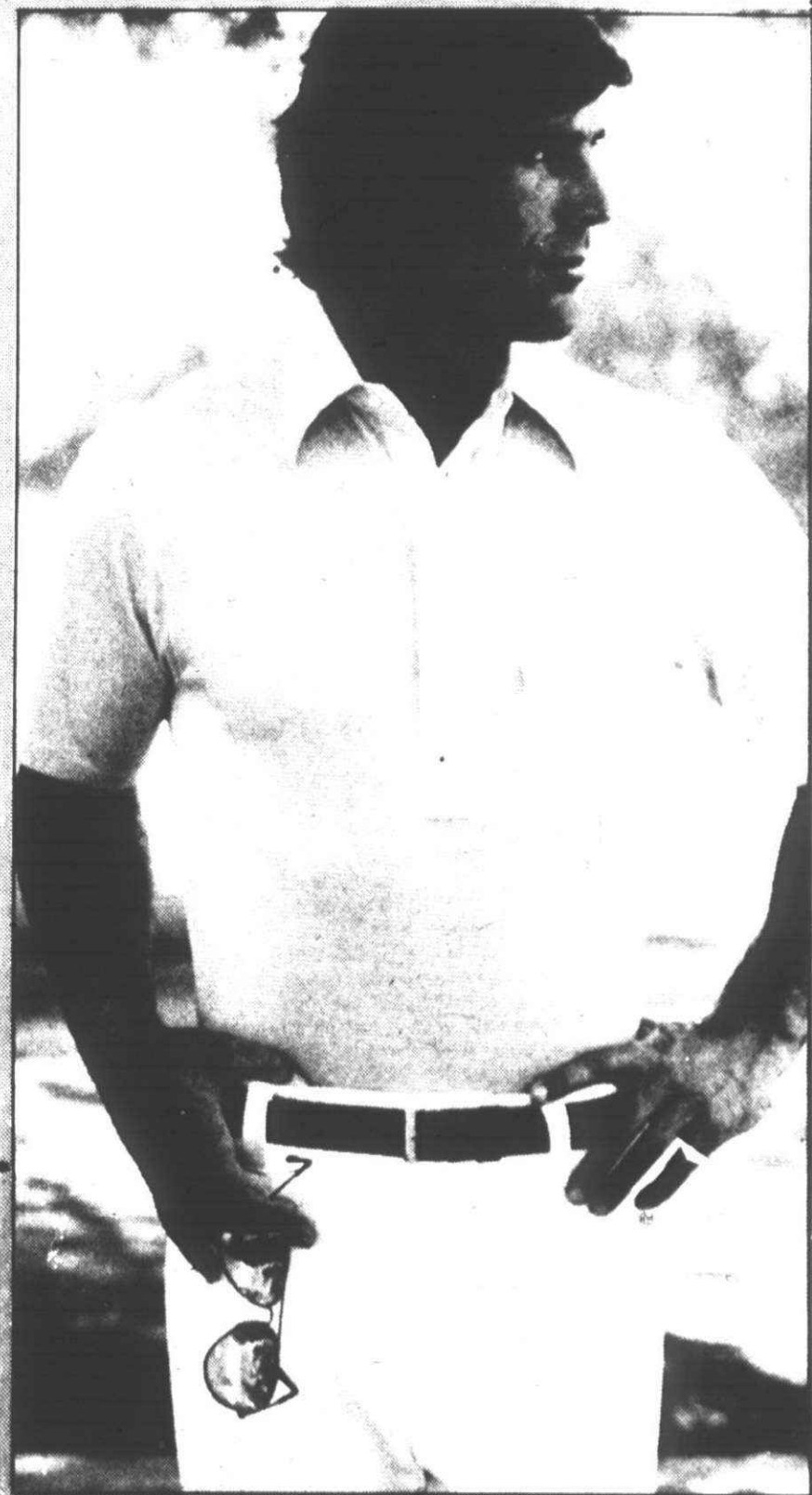
"If you specify land for such a center," said Manore "the price of the land becomes unrealistic. Most regional centers are developed from land the builder has had rezoned."

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
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Let sun shine, says Harrison

Public officials who adamantly oppose broad open meeting laws have never operated under one, says a Florida attorney experienced in the operation of that state's "sunshine" law.

Baya Harrison spent four years in the Florida attorney general's office including 18 months as deputy. "Our office interpreted and enforced the sunshine law," said Harrison, now in private practice in Tallahassee.

Harrison was touring Michigan this week with State Rep. David Hollister (D-Lansing), author of a Common Cause-supported bill requiring virtually all policy-making bodies in Michigan to hold all portions of all their meetings in public.

The bill has strong opposition from

school boards, city councils, townships and counties.

"THE PROBLEMS come basically from the little ward politicians, the back-slapping good ol' boys who don't like the heat they get at public meetings," said Harrison.

But his message is reassuring: Florida's experience has been that opening up meetings has stirred strong public interest and done local government virtually no harm.

Hollister notes that "school boards are the most vocal opponents of my sunshine bill." But Harrison said that Florida school boards found they had actually gained public support when it came to bargaining with faculty unions by letting the public know the broad outlines of the school district's bargaining position.

Harrison was critical of an amendment to a senate bill that lists many exceptions to the open meeting rule. The amendment, offered by Sen. Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park), would allow "information" meetings to be held in secret.

"Information meetings are the most important ones," Harrison said. "Voting is largely ceremonial. By having information, the public has the opportunity to increase its alternatives. It's the whole basis of Jeffersonian democracy. It's good for the public to be there during the decision-making process."

LOCAL SCHOOL and community college board members raised several objections to open meeting bills last month in a public hearing in Livonia. Harrison had these replies:

•Labor negotiations—Michigan officials say strategy discussions should be held in secret so unions won't know management's strategy. Harrison said "major policy decisions should be talked out before the public" although "detailed, nitty-gritty" could be discussed elsewhere.

Florida's law exempts labor negotiations from the public meeting law, but Harrison says Hollister's bill is superior because it would allow no exceptions.

•Evaluations—Michigan officials say discussions of personnel should occur behind closed doors. Harrison contends "the process should be public. If someone is to occupy a major position in a tax-supported agency, the public as well as the board should know what kind of job he's doing."

Florida exempts faculty evaluations and records from public scrutiny, but hearings on tenure are open.

•Student discipline—Florida school boards rarely handle these cases because they are taken care of at the administrative level. But if a student's appeal to the board involves a policy decision, the discussion is held in public.

•Real estate—Michigan officials contend land prices would be driven up if speculators knew what acreage a government was considering buying.

Harrison's strongest defense of open meetings was on this point: "There are more corruptions, more payoffs, more kickbacks and more bribes in land negotiations with developers than in any other area."

In Florida, three Pinellas County commissioners have been indicted in the last 15 months for taking kickbacks from developers that were discovered because of the open meeting process.

VIOLATION of Florida's law is a misdemeanor. Harrison said several entire school boards have been indicted, "but the conviction rate is low."

"Usually they didn't have an attorney to advise them, and they didn't realize they were doing wrong."

"Nine times out of 10, a call from the attorney general's office will get them to open up."

He said removal from office could be one penalty, but he advised against criminal proceedings. A Florida remedy is for a citizen to get a court injunction against secret meetings and to collect damages and attorney fees.

DESPITE VEHEMENT opposition, Rep. Hollister said his bill (HB 5684) is the only one with any chance in the legislature.

The senate bill (SB 920) has been so riddled with amendments that it can't win support from open meeting advocates, Hollister said.

Hollister is a former teacher of Spanish-speaking high school dropouts in the Lansing area. He was chairman of the Ingham County Board of Commissioners before winning his House seat.

He credited Dick Baker, a youthful candidate for the Lansing City Council, with being the first to promote a sunshine rule for local government. Hollister predicted more young candidates would run on open meeting platforms.

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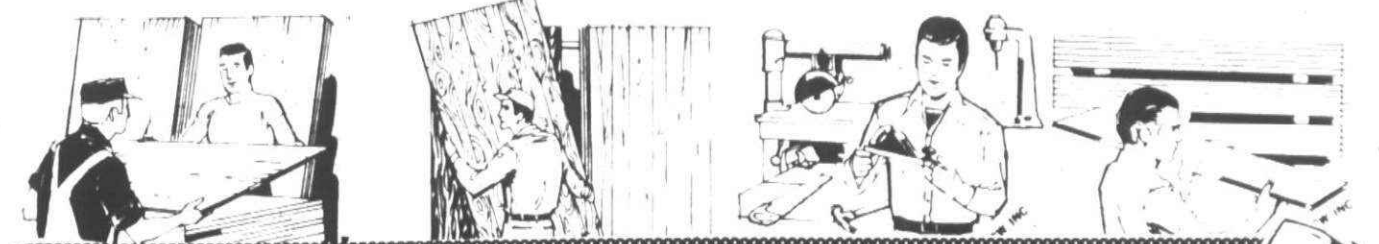
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

Area Democratic congressmen got high marks from Americans for Democratic Action (ADA), a national liberal political organization which rated them on 19 "most critical" House votes.

SC record policy queried

Even as the Schoolcraft College board was liberalizing its policy on student records, it found itself under pressure to reveal details of its long waiting lists for entry into certain programs—notably nursing.

Administration policy is to tell a student where he is on a waiting list but not the names of others on the list.

The discussion at last week's board meeting was triggered by student complaints that the lists were altered—specifically, that a student found himself lower on the nursing program waiting list one day than he had at an earlier date.

"THERE'S NOTHING confidential," said trustee Arch Vallier. "There's no document in her (Admissions Director Barbara Geil's) office except grades that's not public information."

College President C. Nelson Grote wasn't so sure that was true but promised to check.

A Livonia mother who entered Schoolcraft in her 30s objected that students were being placed on the waiting list for the nursing program as early as the 10th grade. She called the policy unfair to prospective older students.

Administrators replied that parents think it would be unfair for their children to have to wait as much as three years after graduating from high school to enter the program. They added students on waiting lists can often take other required courses—basic biology or math—while waiting for admission to the specialized program.

WHAT PROMPTED the debate on waiting lists was a new policy which the board passed without dissent—the policy on confidentiality of student records.

It was necessitated by the new federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

The new policy allows "present and former students" to "inspect, review and challenge the contents of their official records" according to provisions of the privacy act.

It continues the policy of keeping confidential records of students unless the student gives written authorization or there is a court order calling for a record.

Information that is considered to be public includes: whether a person is enrolled at the college, dates of enrollment, degrees earned and the dates they were earned.

Kadish rules out another SC term

Paul Y. Kadish has publicly ruled out running for another office in 1976. The chairman of the Schoolcraft College board opened the Jan. 28 meeting with that announcement.

Kadish made a try for the State Senate in 1970, and his name often figures in talk of Democratic legislative candidates. But he sought to nip those rumors in the bud.

"I am not going to run for any other office this year. There are some very serious issues here at Schoolcraft College—more than at any time in my five years on the board of trustees."

"I do not want to have my decisions as a trustee construed as political," said the Livonia businessman, serving his first year as board chairman.

The Schoolcraft board has been a good jumping-off spot for political careers. Former board chairman R. Robert Geake (R-Northville) is in the Michigan House of Representatives, and former trustee Mary Dumas (R-Livonia) is a Wayne County Commissioner.

The only Michigan representative scoring a perfect 100 was William Brodhead (D-Detroit), whose 17th District includes Redford, Southfield and Farmington.

REP. JAMES Blanchard (D-Pleasant Ridge) was next with a 95. Blanchard's 18th District includes most of Troy. Like Brodhead, Blanchard is a freshman.

ADA was particularly delighted at Blanchard's record because he defeated conservative Republican Robert J. Huber.

Rep. William D. Ford (D-Taylor), whose 15th District includes Garden City, Westland and Canton, rated an 89, highest among veteran Michigan congressmen.

REP. JAMES O'Hara (D-Utica), whose 12th District includes part of Rochester, Avon, scored 74, the same as Rep. Donald Riegle (D-Flint). Both O'Hara and Riegle are seeking the Democratic U.S. Senate nomination.

Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor), a liberal by Republican standards, scored 26. Esch's 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth.

For many years, Esch and Riegle, who was a Republican for seven of his nine years in Congress, had nearly identical voting records.

Rep. William Broomfield (R-Bloomfield) rated an 11 from ADA. Two outstate Michigan Republicans scored five.

ADA said it based its ratings on legislative proposals "to provide emergency jobs, to further women's rights, to reform the tax structure, reduce defense spending and further the disclosure of the amount of funds provided for the CIA."

It noted that "Republicans were unanimous in support of the president's veto of emergency jobs legislation, in opposition to a Consumer Protection Agency, and in opposition to disclosure of CIA appropriations." A congressman is rated as not supporting a measure if he is absent. Thus, Sen. Philip Hart (D-Mich.), consistently liberal over the years, slipped to a 61 in the current rating because he was hospitalized with cancer.

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Mind's power can fix stopped watches



A while ago I suggested a few little tests by which you could prove your ability to send out a thought that would be felt and heard and acted upon by a person who was unaware of your attempts.

Many readers have written to say they have tried these tests and were successful.

In these enlightened times most people are aware that we can and do transmit our thoughts clairvoyantly to others even when we are not trying.

IN AN earlier column I discussed poltergeists with you. Poltergeists, often mistaken for ghosts, are really nothing more than the physical manifestation of human energies generated and released by living, breathing human beings.

This is not to say that those who are plagued by poltergeists are consciously causing the weird things that take place.

However, traumas in our lives sometimes cause anger, frustrations and anxieties that build up energies which must be released.

The six-week exhibit of 115 items from the collections of 38 U.S. presidents will open at 9 a.m., Saturday, Jan. 24. The closing date is March 7.

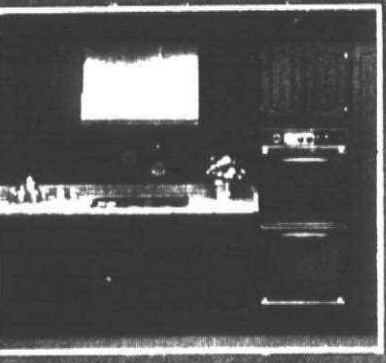

The museum is open five days a week, Wednesday through Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

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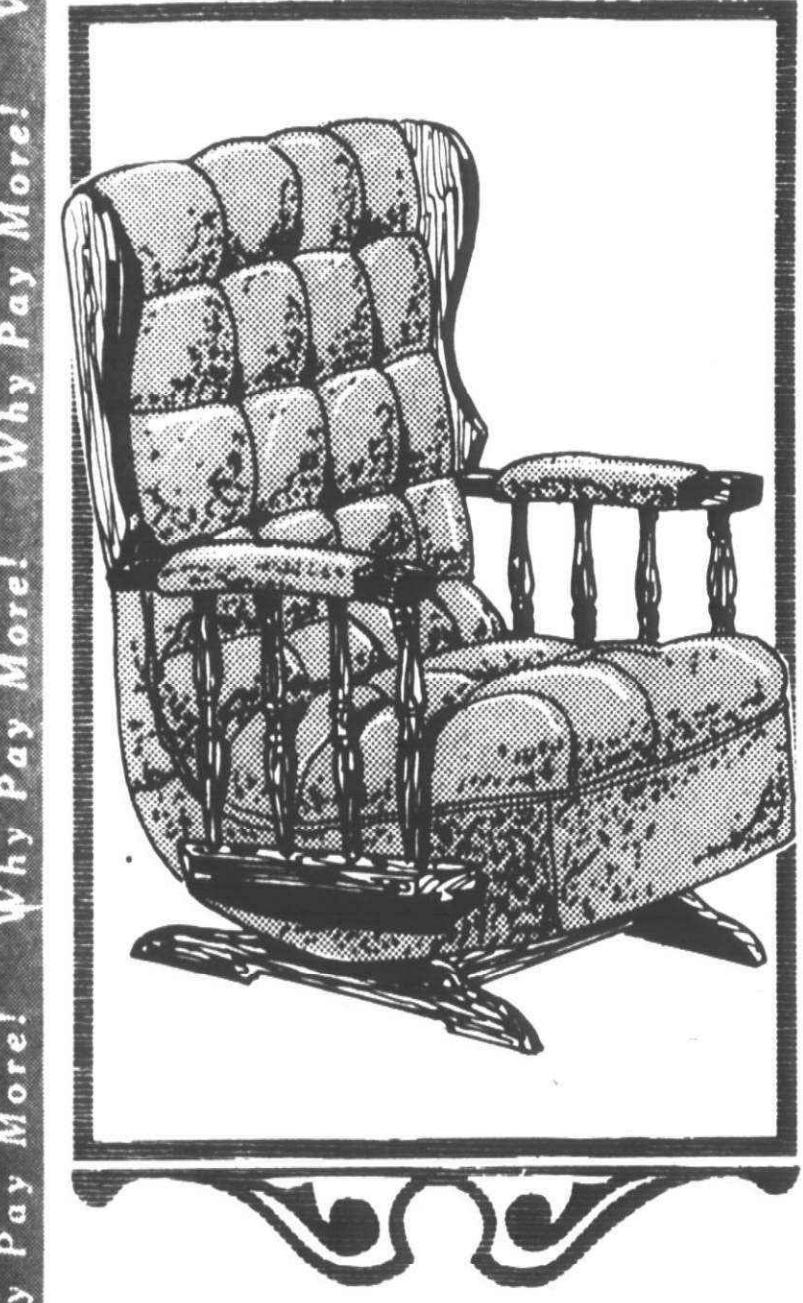
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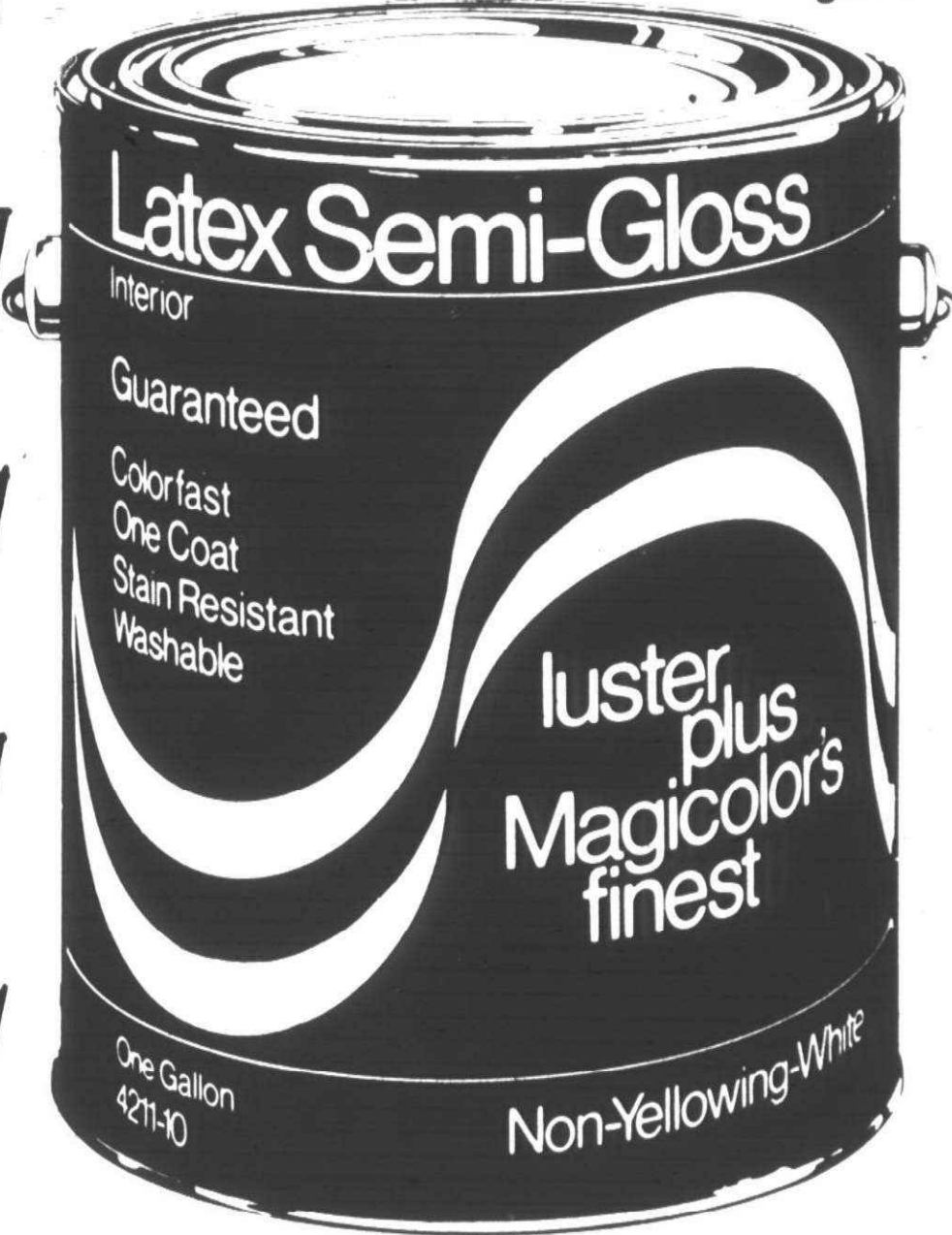

Cityhood for Canton is around the corner

Quite recently there was a great deal of concern generated by the name Canton would use as its postal designation to accompany its promised new zip code.

Names such as Canton Center, Canton Farms, Canton Township and Plymouthville were among those bandied about until the board decided that just plain old Canton was good enough.

A suggestion was made and supported by several board members that a referendum be held sometime during the year so the people could speak en masse to the issue.

With three ballots already scheduled this year, the residents should have ample opportunity to voice their feelings on the issue.

But perhaps the concern, and there appears to be quite a bit, is premature.

FOR EXAMPLE, how about the City of Canton?

If one looks at the expected growth of the township according to planner Mike Manore, Canton may become a city sooner than many of us think.

Continued residential expansion is expected and at the same rate if not faster.

Predictions in the master land use plan call for at least 40,000 people by 1980, and about 100,000 by 1995.

According to Manore's estimates, there is enough development already started or "in the ground" to house another 32,000 people, without the development of fallow land.

The question then becomes at what point does five mills no longer provide the necessary services to township residents.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein says it's a matter of demand. "It depends on what the people want," he said. "It depends on the orientation of the people that move in."

"It will depend on the whether or not they want control over and ownership of the roads, and whether or not they will want the highly sophisticated kinds of fire and police protection that only cities can provide."

THE PROBLEM simply put by Greenstein is that cities can levy up to 20 mills without going to the people for a vote. Police departments and fire departments can't be up in the air every time a township has to go to the people for additional millage because all millage votes are set for a designated time period.

None are voted for indefinite periods of time.

Now let's look at what people are expected to move into Canton.

According to Manore, most new residents of Canton are people looking for a second or third home—larger new houses.

Where do they come from? "West of Telegraph Road," says Manore.

West of Telegraph to Canton is nothing but cities with the exception of Redford Township, and all have large police and fire budgets and departments.

These are people from Livonia, Westland, Garden City and Redford where they have become accustomed to "sophisticated police and fire services."

Cityhood for Canton may not be too far down the road.

And he was elected the 16th president of the United States in 1860.

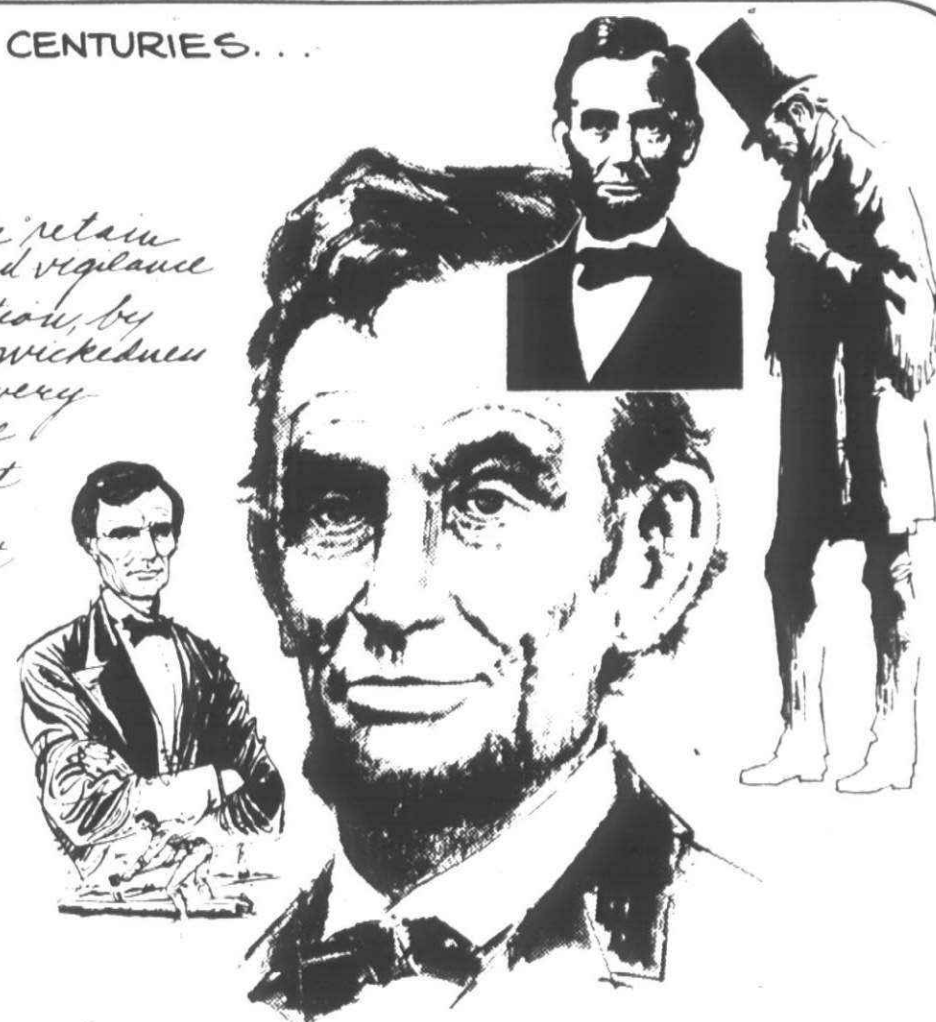
THIS REPEATED failure was Abraham Lincoln, who was born 166 years ago today.

is plagued by inflation, unemployment and lack of pride.

In 1826 he said "I go for all sharing the privileges of the government who assist in bearing its burdens."

Our country today is buffeted by those who feel the world owes them a living and that they must give little in return to reap its rewards.

With our country just having gone through the era of Watergate, Lincoln might be considered a prophet when he said, "If you once forfeit the confidence of your fellow citizens, you can never gain their respect and esteem. It is true that you may fool all of the people some of the time; you can even fool some of the people all of the time, but you can't fool all of the people all of the time."

AS TO THE civil rights movement, Lincoln succinctly said "I have always thought all men should be free; but if any should be slaves, it should first be those who desire it for themselves, and secondly those who desire it for others. When-

ever I hear anyone arguing for slavery I feel a strong impulse to see it tried on him personally."

As to the rights of people, Lincoln said "It has long been a grave question whether any government, not too strong for the liberties of its people, can be strong enough to maintain its existence in great emergencies."

Another statement of his which is appropriate today when people have attacked our form of government with acts of violence, "Among free men there can be no successful appeal from the ballot to the bullet, and they who take such appeal are sure to lose their case and pay the cost."

LINCOLN'S MOST famous address occurred 112 years ago at the dedication of a military cemetery at Gettysburg, Pa. The speech lasted just two minutes, yet it set forth the great goal of our nation.

It enumerated that "our fathers brought forth a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal," and ended with the following words, "It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced—that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain—that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom—and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

The people goofed badly; now there's a jail crisis

On a hot July night in 1968, I was in a cavernous auditorium in Miami Beach and heard a politician say America's problem was leadership; the American people were OK.

Well, Mr. Nixon, you were wrong. Today Wayne County is facing a jail "crisis." The leaders tried to do their job. The people goofed, and badly.

What's worse, the leaders are throwing bricks at each other—the county commissioners are blaming the judges for practically rewriting the county budget, the judges are throwing the book at Sheriff William Lucas, and the mayor of in Westland is fixing to sue the commissioners for wanting to convert a hospital building there into a jail annex.

NO ONE HAS had guts enough to lay the blame at the doorstep of the voters.

In 1972, the Wayne County Board of Commissioners put a proposal on the ballot to build a new \$40 million jail system. It would have included a new 750-inmate jail downtown and a 400-inmate annex on the Westland property.

That Westland annex would have been an honest-to-goodness jail, not the converted hospital building we're now talking about.

The price was incredibly cheap: six-tenths of a mill for five years. Had the voters sense enough to pass it, we would be just one year away from having it paid for.

At the time, this newspaper said editorially: "It's a shame that Wayne County is being forced by a court order to build a new jail. As a matter of civic duty and human decency, the leaders and voters should have provided proper quarters for persons awaiting sentences long ago."

WELL, THE VOTERS, bless their selfish hearts, failed to do their duty.

Even in Westland, where folks are hollering that they're afraid criminals will escape from the converted hospital building and assault them in the night, the proposition was defeated, 9,288 voting in favor and 15,888 against.

So today we're paying the price. The court finds Lucas, a devoted and popular public servant, has

failed to correct such jail conditions as "overcrowding, suicide prevention, jail sanitation, medical services and facilities, methadone detoxification, jail rules, vermin control, plumbing maintenance, and inmate towels, clothing and bedding."

Commissioner Mary Dumas points out that the county, despite voters' rejection of the 1972 millage, still managed to scrape up \$5.5 million for remodeling and renovating the existing jail.

What now? she asks. "Do we deliberately indulge in deficit financing? Do we cut essential services—close the hospital and department of health, cut out services to the aging or children? Cut back on mental health and substance abuse programs? Cut back on the courts—juvenile court, for instance? We have cut the budgets (already) of the Organized Crime Task Force, the Consumer Protection Division, the Metro Narcotics Squad, the Juvenile Facilities Network."

THE COUNTY BOARD last week voted to throw good money after bad by renovating some Dehoco barracks and fixing up that 50-year-old hospital building in Westland. It has the Board of Auditors at work on planning a bond issue for a new jail—which means not only construction costs but high interest rates.

The county board had few other options. If the voters had passed that 1972 millage request, that new jail might have been up by now, and it would have cost the owner of a \$30,000 home something like \$9 a year for five years.

No, Mr. Nixon, the leadership isn't always to blame.

Sometimes people don't understand the meaning of freedom. Freedom isn't the right of a majority to ride roughshod over prisoners, vote down all taxes and pat yourself on the back for being clever. Freedom means fulfilling your responsibilities.



Our Schools Today

(The following column is written by Florence Beier, community relations director for Plymouth Community School District, as another avenue to keep residents informed of school happenings. If you have questions which could be addressed in this column call or write Mrs. Beier at the board of education offices.)

Don't be too surprised if your child comes home one afternoon and says "My teacher was sick today, but we had a really neat substitute. I think it was the superintendent or a principal or someone like that. Anyway it wasn't a regular substitute."

One of the earliest economy measures started in the Plymouth Community School District this year was the requirement that every administrator substitute at least five days a year.

It also was suggested that teachers fill in wherever possible, that student teachers cover classes and that high school teachers not be replaced for one-day absences.

BY JAN 27, the amount of money saved by these measures was \$4,060.

Administrators had substituted 89 days before the end of January. This included Supt. John M. Hoben teaching mathematics at East Middle School.

The largest number of substitute days so far have been covered by area coordinators and principals at the high schools in the Centennial Educational Park. Many elementary principals also are taking classes in their own buildings and administrators in special education and media services substitute in their own areas.

Not only has the substituting by administrators saved the district \$2,492 by the end of the first semester, but it also is a good

opportunity for the administrators to get back into the classroom and into direct contact with students.

TEACHERS, TOO, have been volunteering to help with children whose regular teacher must be absent.

The 56 days taught by student teachers and other teachers, instead of paid substitutes, saved the district \$1,568 in the first semester.

Another savings in substitute cost has been achieved by a decrease in the number of teacher absences. Teachers have been making an extra effort to be in school. The decrease in the use of personal business days and conference time has meant a significant saving so far.

In this year of financial uncertainty and budget cuts, the efforts made by the school staff have already had an impact on the crisis.

Land plan needs changes

Editor:

I am writing this letter in response to a recent article by Richard Gold titled, "Master land use plan: part I." This article presented the views of Mr. Robert Greenstein and Mr. Michael Manore on the proposed new master land use plan for Canton Township.

The article, in my opinion, did not present the full impact of the plan on our community. This letter will try to correct some of the deficiencies.

The pre-release and release publicity statements made about the plan has had an intimidating affect upon us all. The plan is presented as some kind of emancipation proclamation that will free present and future citizens of Canton from the shackles of over-development, high taxes and starvation.

As a resident, taxpayer and businessman

in this community, I fully support controlled growth. However, I do not support a plan that may have the effect of subsidizing the large developers from taxes until the development of the township makes it feasible to build in the western half of the township.

The publicity given to Mr. Greenstein's plan did not reveal the fact that all but three or four of the farmers working the farmland in the township do not own the land they are tilling.

THE VAST majority of our open land is owned by speculators and developers. The results of this plan will be to shift the burden of taxes from these interests to the rest of the community.

As an alternative to Mr. Greenstein's plan, I propose that the township board consider than adoption of the ordinance similar to the one recently upheld by the U. S. Court of Appeals in San Francisco.

The court upheld the right of a township to limit new housing to 500 units a year. By adopting this ordinance, it will become economically unfeasible to build the huge subdivisions in the township that are "gobbling up" the land.

Moreover, to aid the real farm interests in the community, the Farmland and Open Space Preservation Act, is available to do this.

Under this act, a farmer who agrees not to develop his land for 10 years can have his property taxes lowered without shifting the burden to the rest of the community.

I hope this letter will foster more questions and we will open up the community to a full discussion and review of this plan.

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Seniors prefer help at home

Senior citizens from Oakland, western Wayne and Genesee counties say it would be cheaper for the state to help them maintain their own homes than to keep them in institutions—and they'd be happier. They also say they resent Michigan De-

partment of Social Services (DSS) paperwork required when they visit drop-in, or "multi-purpose," centers. Four hundred persons packed the Oakland County commissioners' auditorium in Pontiac Monday to tell their stories to the joint legislative committee on aging, chaired by Sen. Joseph Snyder (D-St.

Clair Shores). The hearing topic was "alternatives to institutional care," and the focus was on how to avoid sending the elderly to nursing homes. Attending the hearing were area State Reps. Ruth McNamee (R-Birmingham), W.V. Brotherton (R-Farmington) and Mel Larsen (R-Oxford).

THE MOST detailed recommendations came not from a senior citizen but a professional in the field, Lynn Schuneman, who handles the hot meals program for the Oakland-Livingston Human Services Agency.

"Twenty to 50 per cent of those in nursing homes wouldn't need to be there if there were supportive services for their homes," she said.

By supportive services Mrs. Schuneman meant help with repairs, relief for persons caring for ailing relatives, snow shoveling and upkeep.

"Supportive services would cost \$508 to \$600 a month, but that's still less than \$1,000 a month for a nursing home," she said.

Her program serves 1,185 meals a day to senior citizens, but only 10 per cent are home-delivered. "Sometimes they have to go into a nursing home because we can't serve one hot meal a day," she said.

A serious problem is lack of public transportation with hydraulic lifts, she said, citing the Farmington area.

JOHN W. FELTES, of the Rochester-Avon Recreation Authority, criticized the paperwork involved in obtaining senior citizen property tax exemptions.

George Johns, chairman of the board at the Walled Lake Multiple Service Center, was applauded for criticizing Form 1928, which he said requires seniors to divulge their assets and incomes, and even to show their social security checks before they can use the centers. Form 1928 reportedly emanates from the DSS.

"We're not signing up for welfare," added Albert Gougeon of Hazel Park.

Staff workers at the multi-purpose centers have become increasingly involved in "detail work, confined to their desks," said Leo Burley of Hazel Park. "The staff has become gradually divorced from the seniors. . . . You have to stand in line to see a staff worker."

From a wheelchair, Dave Vogel, a resident of Oakhill Nursing Home in Farmington who attends the Living Opportunities Center, said the center has a large number of volunteer aides. "But they're female, primarily, and they can't do heavy lifting of patients and wheelchairs."

Vogel asked that school buses be made available during non-class hours for senior citizens and the handicapped.

THE REV. GEORGE Gerritsen of the Lake Orion-Oxford Fish organization said 2,754 persons requested rides last year from NEOTrans, the Northeast Oakland Transportation agency. He asked lawmakers to continue aiding such programs which are funded through the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority.

Harold Draper of the Genesee County Commission on Aging said seniors' "number one desire is to remain in their own homes"—a prospect becoming more difficult with rising property taxes, prices, utility rates and maintenance costs.

Yet it would be cheaper to help seniors remain in their homes, Draper said, than to place them in foster homes or institutions. One alternative, he said, is day care centers.

Sue-Anne Stein, of the Area 1-B Agency on Aging in Berkley, called for "an integrated network of supportive services" to help people live in their own homes.

Such a network would include home repairs, day care centers, telephone reassurance, relief for younger persons caring for an aged relative, and homemaker aid.

Leo Mahany of Royal Oak said many seniors "gradually become poor—illness, home repairs, inflation, property taxes." He called for "thousands of low-cost rental apartments, tax free."

MARTHA KRIEGER, instructor in the Huron School District in New Boston, said the number of senior citizens taking high school work has grown in the last 2½ years from 50 to 250.

"The metric system is about to descend on them," she said. "No-fault insurance is new. Such education is an alternative to institutionalization."

Paul Brunson, a social worker in Macomb County, called Gov. William Milliken's budget cuts "detrimental" and "unjust" because they impact on the aged and disabled.

Sen. Snyder said: "We have available \$3.2 billion (a year) to spend. We have requests for \$4 billion." But he urged senior citizens to make their needs known not only to state government but to the federal government, city councils, school boards and county commissions.

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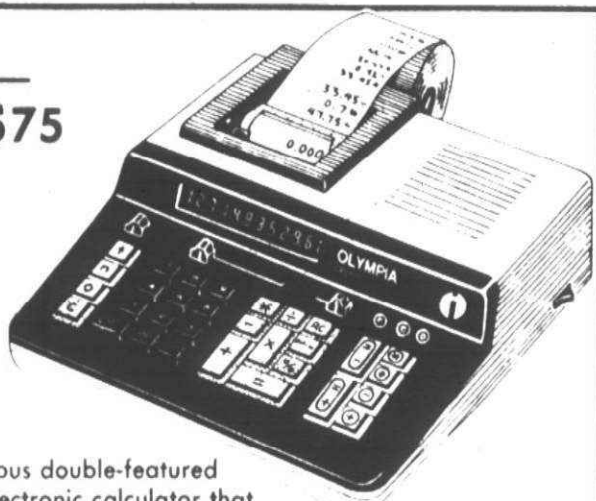
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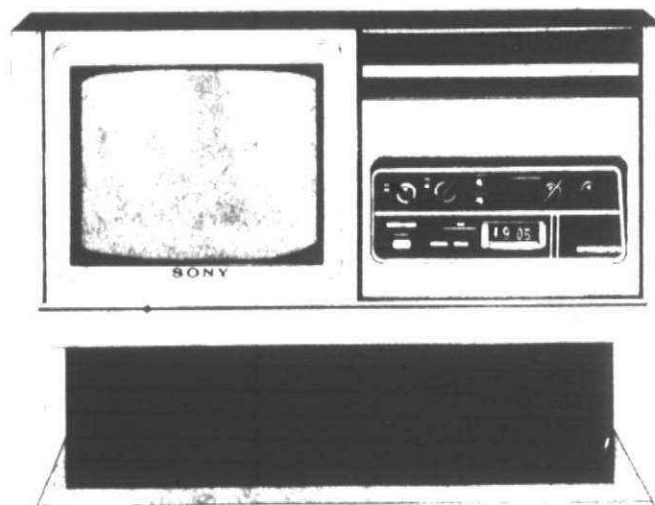
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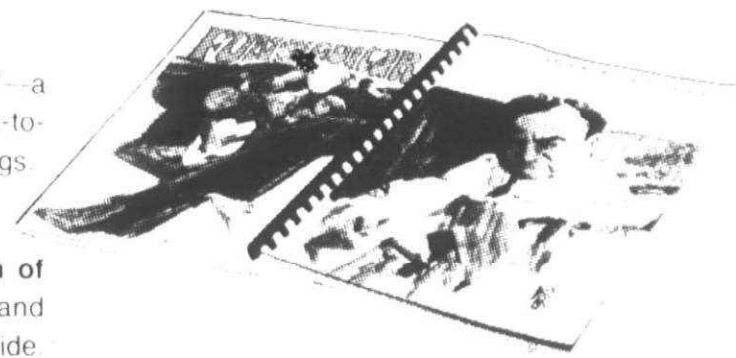
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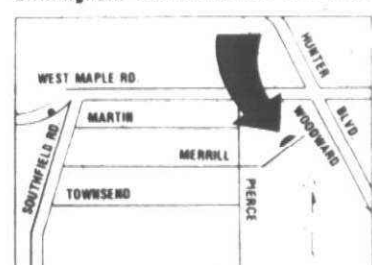

"It was in relation to a lawsuit on sewer extension in the township. All the township officers were sued individually and collectively. It was about two years ago. They wanted \$75,000 apiece as I recall, but the suit was subsequently dropped. Since then, nothing has been done about insurance, but we might take another look."

"If Canton board members aren't insured, they should be," commented Ray Quada, assistant City Manager of Plymouth.

"It may appear unusual, but it's a good idea, especially when you're dealing with rezoning."

According to Quada, the problem developed some years ago in Ohio when the Ohio State Supreme Court held a member

of a city commission responsible when a citizen claimed a rezoning had prevented him from making a living.

Since then, he said, many municipalities in Ohio have taken out legal liability insurance.

"We're in the process of investigating it right now for Plymouth," said Quada.

"It's a problem we're getting into, especially in our police department. An officer is named as an employee and an individual for something he might do in the course of his duty, and he needs protection."

"A suit might say in his overzealousness he was negligent beyond the control of the city and he would be personally liable."

"I hope we decide to insure our employees, the city, and the commissioners as well. It's a good idea."

traditional education, but favor a blending of the two methods.

"I'm not only asking for option, but would like to know what those options are. I like the educational advantages at Gallimore and would like those advantages to come with us to the new school."

Trustees George Lawton and Thomas Yack assured parents they would have opportunity to meet with principals and staffs of the new schools to discuss well in advance of the buildings' being opened what the approach will be in those buildings.

George Merchant of Concerned Parents said it "was very grandiose but hypocritical for the board to talk about options when 11th and 12th graders have no options. They take modular or nothing."

"The input to this board should come from parents of children, but choices and

options often aren't available." He then pledged that Concerned Parents would work "to correct what has become an unbearable situation."

Ms. Benson answered that studies are now under way and there will be recommendations from the administration which will result in changes to provide more options to residents in the district.

SUPERINTENDENT John M. Hoben said the three new elementaries will be of identical design and that the specifications are flexible enough to accommodate many teaching styles and approaches.

There will be 22 contained classrooms in each building—some seating 32 students and others seating 28. The media centers will be the "spine" of the building, he added.

Rooms have been set aside for art and music, science and home economics for future use, Hoben said.

The staff for Field School is pretty well established now because it is being transferred from Central Elementary School. The other schools also will be staffed primarily with teachers now instructing in existing buildings such as Gallimore, he added.

Each school will cost about \$1.8 million, Hoben explained, which is considerably less expensive than if traditional methods of construction were followed and separate designs drawn up for each school.

On the day of hearts and flowers, he will spend his time as he does on other days—acting as a matchmaker.

Not one to stalk a comely lass or lad with a bow and arrow, Philips relies instead on a compatibility questionnaire sent out to all those who wish to take advantage of his service.

Computer dating is not for him. "The computer is cold, impersonal and expensive," he says. "There is no way a computer could scan the paragraph our clients write about what they are looking for in an ideal mate."

PHILIPS FEELS respect for those who opt for a dating service.

"They are more honest about their situation than the people who go to bars hoping to meet a mate, but claiming they are just going out for a pleasant evening."

He feels it is important to continue this kind of openness when they respond to his questionnaire.

"The more truthful they are, the greater the probability that they will find the right person," Philips said.

"Do you object to dating someone with children?" asks one question. "Have you a good sense of humor?" says another. "How interested are you in getting married as soon as possible?"

SALLY AND GORDON, middle-aged singles who live in this area, indicated an interest on their questionnaires in early marriage.

Sally was a widow with two children, one a boy who had been asking most of the males he met since his father's death. "Will you be my daddy?"

"It's hard to meet men, especially at my age," says Sally.

Gordon found it difficult to maintain a lasting relationship because he was often out of town on business.

"I called Date-A-Mate and asked for a brochure," continues Sally. "I filled out the questionnaire and sent it in. Not too much later I began to receive phone calls, one of them from Gordon."

"It was not at all embarrassing. They would call and say they were from Date-A-Mate and had received my name. Then we'd talk. By the time you make a date you know a little about each other."

"It's much better than going to clubs or bars to meet men. It is a discreet way of meeting someone. If you find you don't like him, you just say you are busy the next time he calls."

ON THEIR FIRST DATE Gordon and Sally went to the movies. In about two months they started going steady. Five months after their first meeting they were



married. That was a few months ago, so this will be their first Valentine's Day together.

"I would never have met anyone like him," smiles Sally. "We were in different circles. If run right, dating services can do a lot of good."

"Many women are embarrassed to put out the news they are looking for a man. So instead they go to a bar, let a stranger buy them a drink, dance all night and then make a date. With the dating service, they can be more selective."

When it receives the compatibility questionnaires, Date-A-Mate goes over them carefully. (It also keeps them strictly confidential.) Once possible matches are made, clients receive by mail several names and phone numbers of persons with whom the company feels they will be compatible.

"Usually the gentleman calls," says Philips. "But if he doesn't, we suggest the woman drop him a note or give him a call. If they meet someone and start to date on a serious basis, or if they become engaged, we ask them to drop us a line. Then we discontinue matching them."

On the other hand, if a member fails to feel the right vibes with her first few dates, she can continue to keep her name on file.

DATE-A-MATE charges range from \$25-\$75 depending on the number of referrals the client needs and the time his file is kept active.

"We keep our fees low because we hire no salesmen to go after the people who request our brochure and questionnaire," notes Philips. "We have no walk-in office, expensive merchandising methods or computer. As a result we get a bigger membership. The more people you have to match, the better the service is."

Anti-smoking 'Bentley project' is set to go statewide

The Bentley Project, an anti-smoking program that began in the Livonia high school, is taking its first steps toward statewide implementation, equipped with a big check from some Schoolcraft College students who know its value.

The project, now four years old, works with the American Cancer Society to send high school students into elementary schools to tell the youngsters there all the reasons they shouldn't smoke.

From Bentley beginnings, it has spread to Stevenson and Churchill High Schools in Livonia, Redford Union High, Crestwood High in Dearborn Heights, Northville High and the Wayne-Westland school district.

And Friday, Feb. 13, Bentley Principal Albert Zack and two students on the school's anti-smoking team will go to Lansing with Shirley R. Romeyn, American Cancer Society public-education director, to take a slide presentation of the project

to the cancer group's state public-education committee.

The hope, Mrs. Romeyn said, is that the slides and narrative prepared by Bentley students can form the basis of a state campaign to get into elementary classrooms all over Michigan and make kids decide not to smoke.

PART OF THE FUNDING for a move to spread a good idea statewide will come from the \$2,605 that was presented last week to Dr. Henry J. Vandenberg Jr.,

president of the American Cancer Society in Wayne County, in the Waterman Center at Schoolcraft College.

The check represented proceeds of the Walk for Mankind that was sponsored last year by the SC campus Jaycee group.

The decision to present it to the ACS with the recommendation that it spread the work of the Bentley project came from enthusiastic anti-smoking team alumni, Sandy Altschul and Steve Akey. Altschul, who graduated from Bentley, and Akey, a Stevenson grad, now are Schoolcraft students but still enthusiastic about the work of the anti-smoking teams.

AS THE BENTLEY project works, members of the teams are chosen at the beginning of each school year.

After training, they make scheduled visits to every elementary school in the district once during the year, sending two students into every classroom.

"We tell the kids all the good things about not smoking," said Jill Ochalek, third member of her family to be on the Bentley team and one of the students who will go with Zack for the Lansing presentation.

"We show them we are people who are so involved in activities at school and through other organizations that we don't have to smoke."

"And we seem to get a lot of response. The children write us letters and send us pictures and we hope we are getting across the message."

MEMBERSHIP ON the team is a prestige thing at Bentley, said Rainer Theisen, team member and student council president. "We pick members at the end of the

sophomore year, and last year there were 70 applicants for a dozen openings—all good students and all the kind who are involved in many activities."

It's because of the kind of student who goes out to the elementary schools that the program is able to carry the message well, Zack said.

"These are the kind of people with whom the younger children can identify, and they are the ones who can offer an example to resist the peer pressure to smoke."

"This is the only sustained, aggressive effort against smoking, and it's the only kind of effort that can work. It's obvious, from the number of people who do smoke despite medical warnings, that if you wait until kids are in junior high or high school it's too late."

MRS. ROMEYN AGREED that the project, which she and Zack worked out in discussions four years ago, is the only long-term effort of its kind in the state, "although there have been some one-shot programs."

"It's the kind of thing that can work because it's positive," she said. "The thing that leads young people to start smoking is peer pressure, and this counters it."

"Kids aren't worried about the medical aspects of smoking. That danger is a long way off. That's why we hardly ever send physicians into classrooms. 'An older student, obviously enjoying life without smoking, can say it much better.'"

Joining Principal Zack and Jill Ochalek in the trip to Lansing will be Art Simpson. Their presentation will be an explanation of how to get an anti-smoking program started in any school district.

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Petitions at mall

Endangered species their cause

When members of the Detroit Audubon Society set up a booth in the Livonia Mall Saturday, Feb. 14 to educate the public about saving whales, dolphins and harp seals, one of those helping out will be Isabel Billings of Redford Township.

A first grade teacher in Keeler Elementary School in the Redford Union School District until her retirement in 1974, Mrs. Billings believes "the more you read, the more you realize the importance of saving rivers, green spots and animals."

She added: "People are being made aware of the fact that certain animal species are being over-killed and are in danger of disappearing completely."

At the Audubon Society booth will be petitions to be signed by the public to protest the killing of two endangered species, the whale and the harp seal. A leaflet on the killing of dolphins by tuna fishermen who inadvertently catch them in their nets will also be available.

"WE WANT the public to know that the tuna industry is not doing what it should to prevent dolphins from being caught this way," said Mrs. Joanne Stevens, a Northville resident who is employed by a Southfield insurance company. "No effort is

being made to correct the situation." The petitions to save the whales will be forwarded to the Russian and Japanese governments, which are not taking steps to decrease the killing of whales as other countries have.

"They use them for oil and other products," said Mrs. Stevens, who is in charge of the petition drive. "We feel that there are suitable substitutes available which can be used to replace the oil and other parts taken from the whale."

"With all this killing the whales are going to be killed off, and will be no more. We are going to have to learn that everything in the ocean relates to us. The more that is taken from the ocean, the more likelihood there will be of an adverse effect on mankind."

A free program on diabetes, one of America's major health problems, will be held Friday, Feb. 13, from 4-6 p.m. in Sentry Drug Store, Five Mile at Farmington, Livonia.

A representative of the Western Wayne County Unit of the American Diabetes Association, Michigan affiliate, will provide information on the activities of the association.

A representative of Becton-Dickinson Inc., a major supplier of diabetic needs, will discuss diet, care and use of needles and supplies and answer questions on diabetes.

THE PETITIONS on the harp seal will be sent to the government of Norway protesting the killing of the baby harp seals by Norwegian sealers who kill them during the first week of life when the seals' fur is white.

The fur is used mainly as trim on coats, boots and other items. The blubber may turn up as margarine.

"They are in danger of extinction now," reported Mrs. Stevens. "We have to start putting our values and priorities in order and preserve these seals rather than using them for decorative purposes and commercial gain."

One of the herds of harp seals comes to an area called the "front" off the coast of Newfoundland and Labrador. Swimming in international waters, the seals can be reached by ship.

Public pressure influenced the Canadian government to ban in 1972 use of large factory ships, helicopters and other vehicles to facilitate the slaughter of the harp seal. Only landmen, natives of the island who walk out on the ice or use small boats, were allowed to kill in the Gulf area.

However, in the "front" area "huge Norwegian factory vessels enable Norwegian sealers to club and skin 60,000 baby seals annually," reports a pamphlet of the Animal Protection Institute of America.

They also buy pelts from Canadian landmen.

Groups opposing this slaughter hope that public pressure will also cause the Norwegians to desist in this practice.

"PEOPLE SHOULD not wear real fur at all," said Mrs. Stevens. "Fake fur is plenty warm enough. It's just vanity that makes people want to wear a real animal fur."

Mrs. Billings agreed. Recently she wrote to President Gerald Ford objecting to his wearing a jacket trimmed in wolf fur given to him by people in Alaska.

"The wolf is also an endangered species," she said. "It is a very dubious thing to kill off any species in an area."

She concluded by saying that children are welcome to sign the two petitions because they are unofficial requests to save the whales and harp seals.

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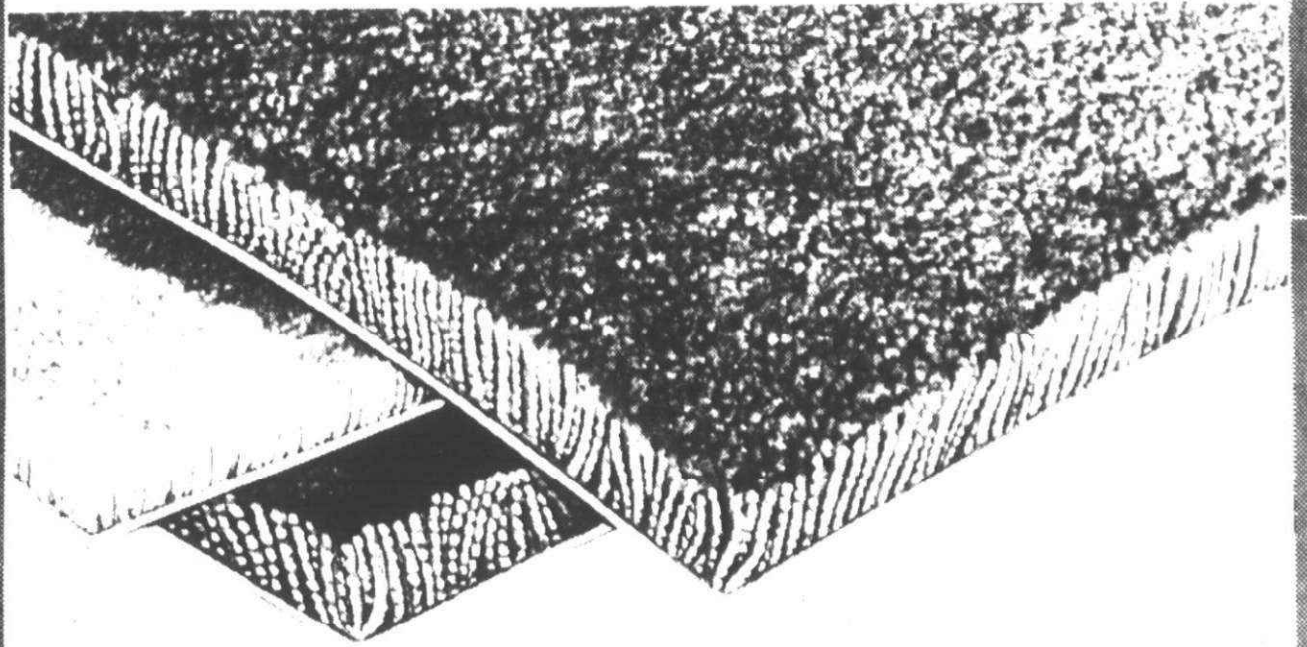
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DeHoCo project volunteers needed

Women volunteers are needed to help the female inmates of the Detroit House of Correction (DeHoCo), according to the chairman of a program involving these women. It is maintained by the Plymouth and Livonia branches of the American Association of University Women.

Launa Wakenhut of the Plymouth AAUW branch said the "goal is to have a one-to-one ratio between volunteers and 'residents,' as the women refer to themselves."

She added: "Prospective volunteers must attend four training sessions. Upon

completion and acceptance into the program they are expected to spend two evenings a month as their part of the commitment. One evening will be spent at the prison with the inmates, the other is reserved for a recourse and planning meeting."

Training session for those interested in working in the program are scheduled on four Wednesdays at 7:30 p.m. beginning Feb. 18 and running through March 10. They will be in Pilgrim United Church of Christ, 38075 Seven Mile, Livonia. A fifth session, a tour of DeHoCo, will be scheduled later.

THE AAUW has established two different groups at the prison. One is called Lifeliners, for women serving life terms, another called Project STEP-UP for women serving more than seven years.

Presently there are nine volunteers working with 15 of the 17 lifers at DeHoCo, and

eight working with the 20-25 women in the STEP-UP program.

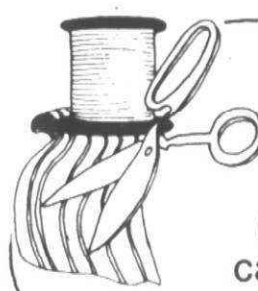
Mrs. Wakenhut said that "as interest in Lifeliners and STEP-UP has spread among the inmates, it has been difficult to find enough volunteers to maintain the desired balance."

Thelma Ruckhaber of the Livonia AAUW branch said that after most volunteers come to the prison "they want to spend additional evenings there because they realize the needs of the women are so great."

She described the typical lifer as "a woman without resources."

She added "She is poorly educated, has no money and may live far away from family and friends. Her age range could be between 17 and 50. She may be either black or white."

Many of the women are bright, she said. "Volunteers often see a spark of potential in them and wonder what they might have

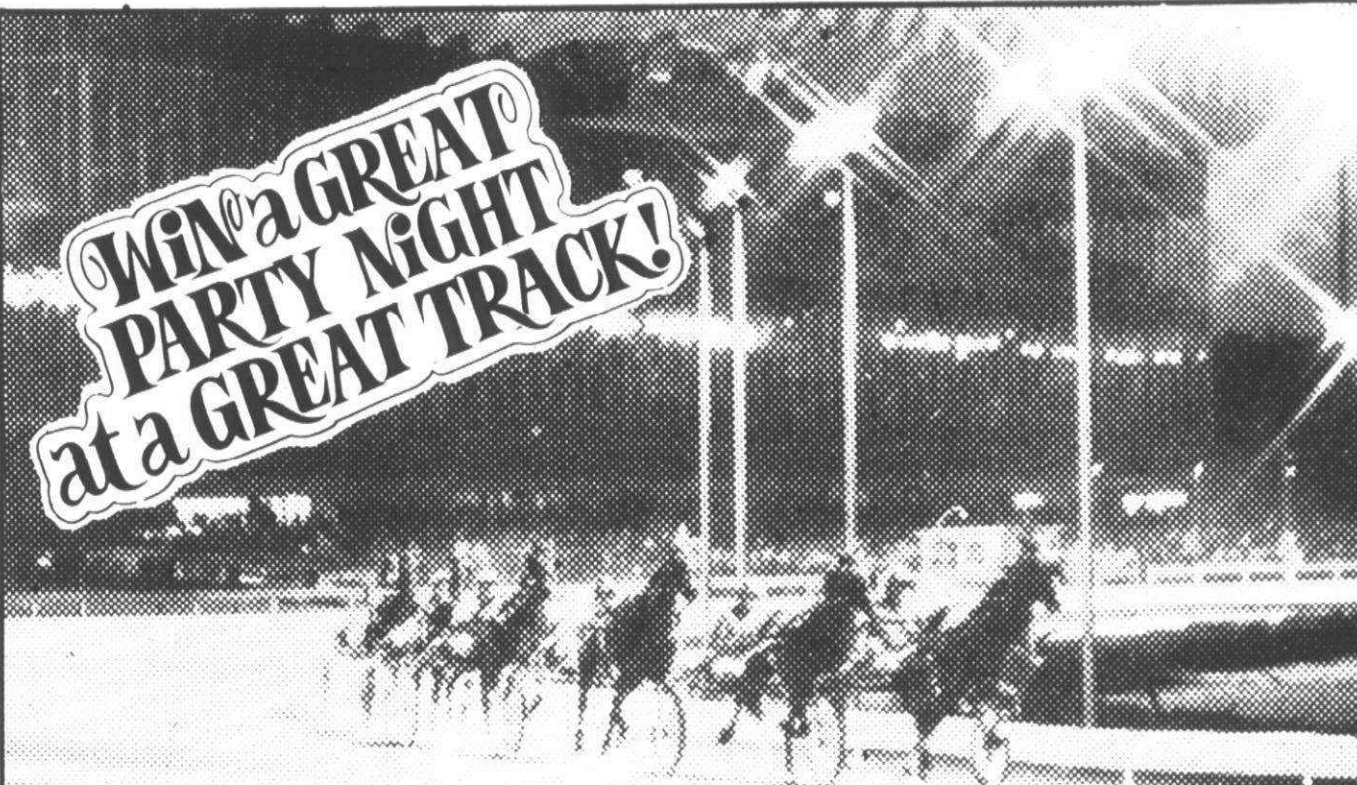

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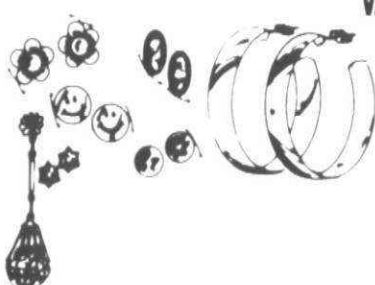

Rev. Routledge given honor

The Rev. G. Douglas Routledge, busy pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Plymouth, really hadn't planned to attend the big session of the Mid-America Sunday School Association when it held its winter seminar in Detroit the end of last month.

He and his wife, Betty, were going to a Chinese restaurant that evening with Tom Hill, Calvary Sunday School superintendent, and his wife, Glenda.

But Hill pulled his car into the parking lot of Ebenezer Baptist Church, where the gathering of several hundred association members was being held, and he suggested the others might like to come in for a few minutes while he played a small part in the program.

And, once inside, Mr. Routledge heard himself being named the association's Pastor of the Year, an honor accorded only twice in its history. The first time was in 1975, and the recipient was Rev. Bartlett L. Hess, pastor of Ward United Presbyterian Church of Livonia.

"THE HONOR really was a surprise out of the blue," said Mr. Routledge, who has been a full-time pastor for 15 years and came to his present post in 1972.

The association, which he described as the "largest Christian education organization in the world," has more than 800 member churches.

"Sunday School association really is a bit of a misnomer," the pastor added, "because the group is involved in the whole spectrum of Christian education."

"The Pastor of the Year award is an example of this widening activity. Up to last year, a top Sunday school superintendent

has been picked each year, but the award to the pastor shows the concern with the whole church."

PASTOR ROUTLEDGE was chosen from among 311 candidates for the honor, and he said it was his understanding that the entire programs of the clergymen's churches formed the basis of the honor.

These include, he said, the pastor's training, attitude toward and participation in Sunday school, attendance at conference and regional meetings, and the church's growth and involvement in home and foreign missions.

In all these areas, the record of Mr. Routledge's achievements indicates high qualification for the honor.

Calvary's current program includes a twice-a-day radio ministry, regular youth activities and an active senior-citizen group in addition to the morning worship and Sunday school activities.

The church also is moving forward with plans for a Christian day school, to open next fall. "We've made no drive for students, but already have 200 applications," Mr. Routledge said.

AS OF AUGUST, as he completed three years as senior pastor of Calvary, the church had shown a 150 per cent growth over the three years, and home and foreign mission giving was up to \$270,000 in 1975, with a budget of \$310,000 projected for 1976.

The honored pastor is a graduate of Ontario Bible College in London, and while a student there was Director of London Youth Guidance and the London organization of Youth For Christ.

Women's panel bringing bicentennial program to area

The Detroit Panel of American Women, scheduled for a March visit to the Wednesday evening series in the Alfred Nobel Library in Livonia, has a new bicentennial program.

The discussion—"The American Dream: Myth or Promise?" is an effort on the part of the group to show varied sections of society the progress from colonial times in the areas of religious freedom, equal education opportunity and the idea that all are created equal.

The group, as it visited the First United Methodist Church of Farmington recently, included Rosemary Doyle, a Livonian who has been active in its work since its organization about a decade ago.

The panel, composed of a number of women of varied backgrounds, will be at the Nobel library Wednesday, March 10 at 8 p.m. Its members plan a special program for children titled "The Green Circle," on Saturday, Feb. 21.

The program as presented in Farmington was the first for the bicentennial format.

PANELIST KATHY Apter wore an American flag on her lapel, the panel's symbol of the white Protestant. She can trace her ancestors back to 1700 in New England. They were all college-educated, and one, a great-great-grandfather was a member of the then-radical Republican party.

Panelist Eleanor Fitzerman wore the Star of David and is a second-generation American of Jewish descent, whose grandparents fled Russia to settle in Michigan. In spite of meager beginnings, her grandfather came to own several apartment buildings. He thought of his religion as being equally important to being an American.

Panelist Rosemary Doyle wore a crucifix. She is a third-generation American stemming from Polish and Austrian farmers. Handed-down stories within the family concerned the fear, distrust, and suspicion

put upon Roman Catholics for several generations, and worship "which was a once-a-month visit from a traveling priest because there was no church." She strives to keep Polish traditions alive in her own family.

Panelist Irma Wood's skin color was her symbol. She alternates between "very sad and very angry because none of my people know where they came from." This was particularly so for her when she attended Detroit's ethnic festivals.

The Afro-American Festival was the only one that didn't display any preserved remnants of the past. Further, no records, even birth records, were kept of blacks for many years in the United States. She was born in the South and has memories of being visited by the Ku Klux Klan.

FAYE MENCZER served as moderator for the panel, whose bicentennial subject is "The American Dream: Myth or Promise?"

ise?" The women zero in on the progress made from colonial times to the present on the topics of religious freedom, equal education opportunities, and are all men created equal.

On the subject of religious freedom, Ms. Apter said it certainly was a reality to the "WASTS (White Anglo-Saxon Protestants) with the establishment of separation of church and state in early America."

The situation continues to remain the same today, "even with the elimination of prayers in schools."

Ms. Fitzerman said religious freedom was a lie for Jews in all but two of the original colonies where they were prohibited from voting or holding office. Today, however, she termed religious freedom for the Jew "a near-reality because I am sure there are Jews who would rather be in a synagogue on their Sabbath than working to make a living as some must."

Ms. Doyle said that after the Revolution-

ary War there were only four colonies that welcomed Catholics "for fear we would take over the country and turn it over to the Pope." Today, Catholics "are renowned for being ahead of the game, buying up land to build a church where and when one is needed."

"Admitting a black into a church was admitting he had a soul," Ms. Woods said, "so it wasn't until after the Civil War that blacks formed their own denominations." Today she knows of but one religious group which discriminates against blacks: the Mormon Church which denies blacks the priesthood.

ON THE SUBJECT OF equal education, Ms. Apter said many years before the public education system was established, "WASP kids were required to attend schools supported by a tax. Job training and apprenticeships were plentiful—if you were a WASP."

The situation today for the white Protestant is only half-true, she said, based on unequal millages that have turned "education into a rich-man-poor-man thing."

Jews who lived in early America were excluded from public schools on religious grounds, "but soon established their own," Ms. Fitzerman said. Equal education is a reality for Jews today, "but only through the 12th grade, because colleges still have quotas."

Catholics suffered educational discrimination in early America, mostly in the large cities, "Boston and New York were the worst," Ms. Doyle said. Today it's a matter of money again, "but Catholics do have a choice."

An early American Massachusetts Supreme Court decision upheld the right of a school to expel a black student, which set a precedent that held for years, while

southern states forbade educating black students at all.

"You can understand that when you know that all the rebellion they (the South) ever had came from the few educated blacks there were," Ms. Woods said. Today, the promise, she said, is still a lie with blacks, overall, "having few skills and no money to support good black schools."

MS. APTER BELIEVES the only men who were meant to be equal were "the men of property—a very select group in colony days." Today, the upper and middle class white is still "more equal," she said.

"He holds more power, has more money and still clings to the idea that he is better," Yet, she says, the WASP represents 50 per cent of the welfare rolls in the United States.

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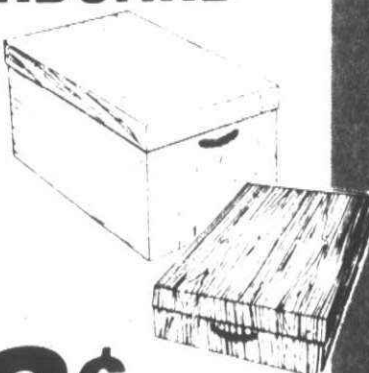

The birth of Cooper's Corners

(Part I)

At one time, in the 1830s, it was a toss-up over which settlement would dominate the area—Plymouth Corners at the intersection of Ann Arbor Trail and Main, or Cooper's Corners at the junction of North Territorial and Beck Roads.

Plymouth Corners survived to become downtown Plymouth; Cooper's Corners, once the nucleus of a lively little community, faded into oblivion.

ITS PEAK. Cooper's Corners had numerous dwellings, a store, a blacksmith shop, a cooper, a schoolhouse and a Methodist church, built in 1835.

It was in this settlement, in the fall of 1826, that William Teeple and his large family, newly arrived from New York State, staked their claim. They arrived with a cow, which they drove all the way from the east, and several wagonloads of household goods. Plymouth's first tax record, dated July 10, 1827, shows that William Teeple owned 200 acres here and paid 3 cents annual tax.

The oldest of Teeple's nine children, Peter Teeple who was born in New Jersey in 1797, was a Plymouth Township highway commissioner in 1834 and 1836. He is said to have owned 100 acres of land here valued at \$125. He married Sarah Losee and their second daughter, Aleta (Lettie), was born near Cooper's Corners on November 20, 1829.

In 1885, long after she left Plymouth, Mrs. Lettie Teeple Penoyer wrote the story of her life for her children. In it she included her recollections of Cooper's Corners.

Lettie Teeple's view of life at Cooper's Corners in the 1830s, as seen through the eyes of a young girl, is contained in a manuscript published in the Fall and Winter 1974 issues of *Michigan History*, a quarterly published by the Michigan Department of State. Written by Lettie in 1885, when she was 56, "The Life of Lettie Teeple" was edited by professor John H. Yzenbaard, of Western Michigan University, and John Hoffman, former editor of *Michigan History*.

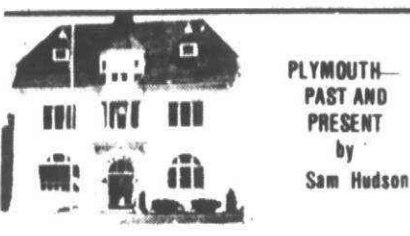
LETTIE WROTE that Cooper's Corners in the early 1830s had a number of "nice buildings painted white and (with) green blinds. Besides a store with candy in the windows, there was a blacksmith shop and a coopershop. It was the first cluster of buildings I had ever seen."

She described her home as "very pleasant indeed: the wild flowers, the green fields, and the lofty forest-trees which appeared to be bowing to each other when the wind blew."

Lettie's father built a log building by the brook and near the woods. There he made "salts," or potash, by leaching wood ashes and "boiling down the lye until it was hard and black." He bought ashes from other settlers who were clearing the land.

Potash, so named because a "pot" was used to boil down the "ashes," was used to make soap. Teeple sold his potash in Detroit, hauling it with his wagon and ox-team. Lettie said it took him nearly a week to make the journey.

When Peter Teeple went back to New York State, in the fall of 1833, Lettie's



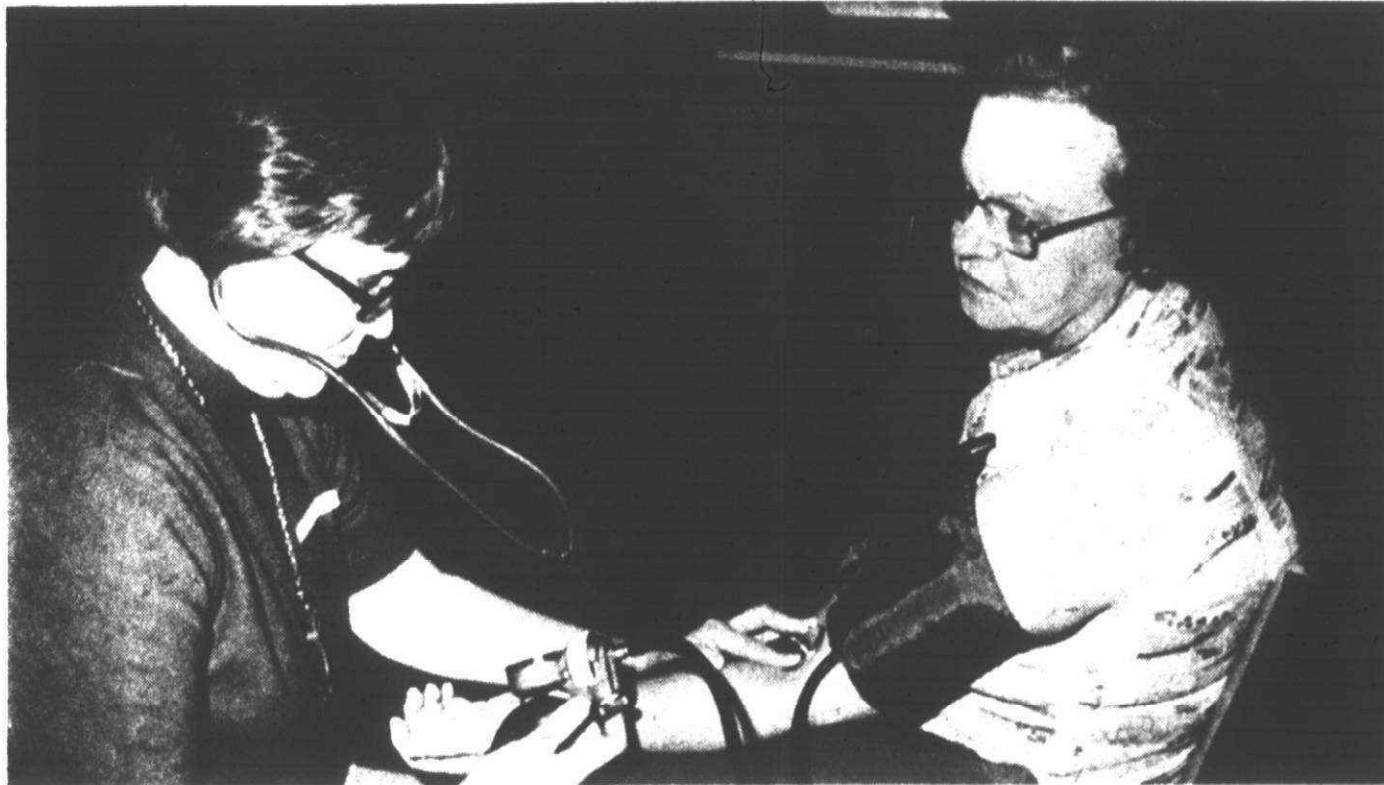
mother hired a boy to help her husk the corn and put it in the cribs. "At the same time," wrote Lettie, "she was fattening a number of hogs; she would yoke up the oxen herself and drive them to and from the fields bringing loads of corn and potatoes. I remember it so well because I had to stay in the house to look after the little ones. Lettie's older sister, Jane, worked in the fields with her mother and the hired hand."

Mrs. Teeple had a pet deer which was fun for the children when it was young. As it got older, it began to kick the children with its forefeet. When they complained to

their mother she would box its ears. Eventually, the neighbors became afraid of the animal and Lettie's father had to kill it. Lettie also had a frog. She dressed it in doll's clothes until her mother made her return it to the brook.

LETTIE RECALLED the day she first saw apples growing on trees. It was during a visit to grandfather Teeple's farm "across the lots." "They were beauties large and red. I can see them now. Father brought apples at different times from Detroit but they were poor, frozen and bruised. So when I saw them on a tree it was a new sight entirely."

She also recalled her first ride in winter behind a team of horses, and her first visit to her father's sugarbush. That was in the spring of 1836, 140 years ago. A sugarbush was a small grove of sugar maples. Yzenbaard and Hoffman, in a footnote to Lettie's manuscript, indicate that Peter Teeple reported a yield of 600 pounds of maple sugar that year.

Long-time local photographer to be feted for contribution

Photographer Davis B. Hillmer of Plymouth will be guest of honor Feb. 13 when the Michigan Photographic Historical Society meets in the Dearborn Inn.

Hillmer, born and raised in Plymouth, will be 80 years old this coming October and has practiced photography for the past 65 years.

Besides working professionally in Detroit for four commercial firms and then in his own studio, Hillmer has been actively involved in photography as an art form.

HILLMER IS THE grandson of William Starkweather, who built the first home in the village of Plymouth in 1825 at the southwest corner of Main and Ann Arbor Trail.

"A turning point in my life was when I learned to read at age nine," recalls Hillmer, "My third grade teacher Anna Smith (after whom Smith Elementary was named), my Grandmother Starkweather's personal friend, got grandma to give me after-school help."

"That was the lift I needed, and I soon was reading like the others in my class. Reading opened up a new world to me, and I am still in that world."

When he was in the first grade, Hillmer decided he needed a camera but didn't get one until about 1910 "when I traded some toys for a 4x5 box plate camera. I could have had a camera before that but spent my money for a rifle and boxing gloves."

"I was soon overwhelmed by photography and by 1913 was taking three photo magazines and was absolutely lost in this fool's paradise."

"In 1912 my brother Karl let me use his 4x5 Pony Prema No. 6, which had been originally purchased in 1902 by a Plymouth barber. This was a very fine folding camera for the time."

HILLMER SOON became one of Plymouth's leading post card photographers. But at \$1 per dozen, postcards didn't lead to wealth, and in March 1916 he went to work for the L. Black Company in Detroit.

He left Black's in November, 1916 because of an illness, did farm work in the spring of 1917, and in the fall went back to Detroit to work for Jeffery White, commercial photographer. After seven months with White, Hillmer took charge of the studio at the Curtis Advertising Company—then known as the Curtis Company.

He was drafted into the U.S. Army in August, 1918 and sent to Camp Custer near Battle Creek where he set up a photo lab for the 14th Division Engineers.

AFTER BEING discharged in 1919, Hillmer joined H. W. Brooks, commercial photography, which was then sold to Smith Brothers.

In March, 1922 Hillmer started his own studio at 65 Canfield Avenue W., Detroit, which he operated for 50 years, providing service largely for department stores. For the entire 50 years, one of his customers was the J.L. Hudson Company, and his industrial accounts included the Hoskins Manufacturing Company, R.C. Mahon Company, and Wyandotte Chemical Company.

"I started fumbling jobs and decided to retire in 1972," he says. "I had been in six different locations. Selling most of my equipment, I moved to Plymouth in August, 1972, which was just in time, as my health really got bad within the next few months."

Although photography provided a living for Hillmer it was more than a means of earning a buck—his photography was an art form.

"I wasn't very old when I stopped shoot-

ing at birds and realized their esthetic interest besides the beauty of song, which is remarkable considering that birds in evolution are quite close to the reptile. Though difficult to photograph, they accounted for much of my time and film."

"Being interested in birds, I naturally was interested in nature generally. Photography came in handy here, and I used it to record my impressions of what I saw. I made many trips across the Ambassador Bridge to Kingsville on Lake Erie where I was lucky to get pictures of American whistling swans, Canadian geese, and migrating ducks."

"It was fun to wander around with a light camera expecting to be rewarded pictorially," he recalls. "Some of my prints have been exhibited in national and state shows."

"In my later years, people, as they are naturally, have been fine subjects for my camera. But I never take pictures of people that would prove embarrassing."

About 1900, Hillmer began reading about composition and pattern in the final print, and about principles based on Japanese art. "The principles eventually became sort of automatic with me. But there are no hard and fast rules in art. Each artist must determine his own path, learning, of course, from the experience of others."

The dinner at which Hillmer will be honored begins with cocktails at 6:30 and dinner at 7:30 p.m. Reservations must be made by Feb. 10 with Don Wallace of 34911 Ash, City of Wayne. Dinner is \$8 per person. A display of Hillmer's work will be set up in the Dearborn Inn that evening.

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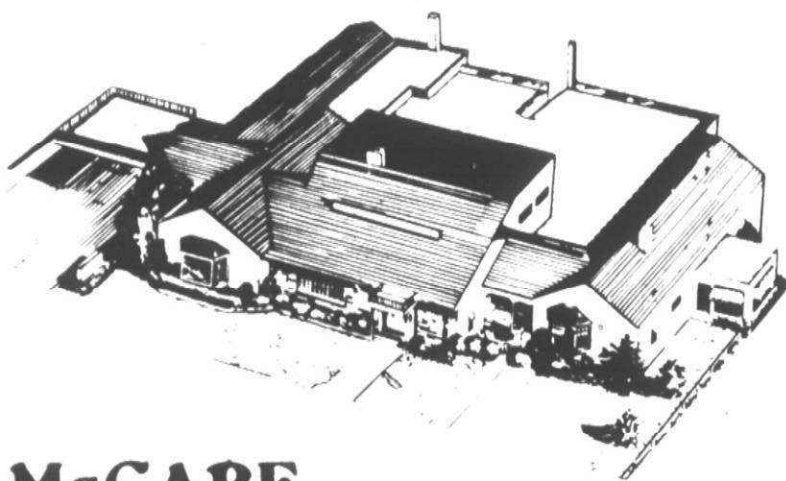
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It has been quite some time since we were inspired to throw out our collective chests and chant "Michigan, My Michigan." Most of the emphasis was reserved for Michigan Week when we told the world the glories of the state.

But when Sheila Young, the youthful Detroit speedskater, stood on the podium at Innsbruck, Austria, and accepted the gold medal for her victory in the Olympic Games, she gave all of us an opportunity to lean back and shout with pride: "Michigan, My Michigan."

The gold medal was the first ever won by an American in the winter games. And, along with her silver and bronze medals that made her a triple medal winner, she took her place with the world's best speed skaters and left an indelible mark on world competition.

As she stood on the podium with the eyes of the world on her through the medium of television, she caused us to forget, at least temporarily, the economic problems—the long lines of the unemployed, spiraling inflation and other fractures in our system that have made Michigan one of the hardest hit of all states.

HERE WAS A GIRL, who attended Denby High School in Detroit as a youth and competed in all the neighborhood races on the city rinks, now being acclaimed as one of the world's best as a reward for her years of sacrifice. And as she stood there, with the strains of the national anthem ringing in her ears, she furnished an example for all youth.

Sitting in his easy chair, with eyes fixed on the tube, The Stroller couldn't help link-

ing her with the other great athletes that Michigan has produced through the years. And she has taken her rightful place among them.

As the picture faded from the tube, The Stroller could see again, in his mind's eye, the flashing spikes of Ty Cobb who roamed the outfield for the Tigers, and still is rated the greatest ball player ever to don a uniform.

Again he saw Gar Wood, the Gray Fox, cutting through the waters of the Detroit River into two beautiful plumes with his Miss America to become the speedboat king of the world. He had good reason to recall this picture as The Stroller had the good fortune to ride with Gar in Miss America X when he established the record.

Then, in review, came the sight of Mickey Cochrane (Black Mike) scoring the winning run that made the Tigers the world champions in 1935 and stamped him as the most fiery leader of his time.

AND WITH THESE pictures again came the sight of Newell Banks, the world check champion, defeating 16 opponents while blind-folded in one of the greatest displays of concentration of all time.

Back in those years we also had little Eddie Tolan, a black youth from Cass Tech, standing on the podium at the Olympic Games and being acclaimed as the world's fastest human.

Through this maze of mental pictures came the sight of Marion Ladewig, who foresaw the softball diamonds of Grand Rapids to win the national all star bowling tournament eight times and earn ranking as the greatest woman bowler of all time.

One by one these Michigan heroes passed in review and then, as the tube flashed back to Sheila's acceptance of the gold medal, The Stroller relived another thrill.

Seeing her standing there reminded him of the evening in Chicago in 1937 when Joe Louis knocked out Jimmy Braddock to become the heavyweight champion of the world.

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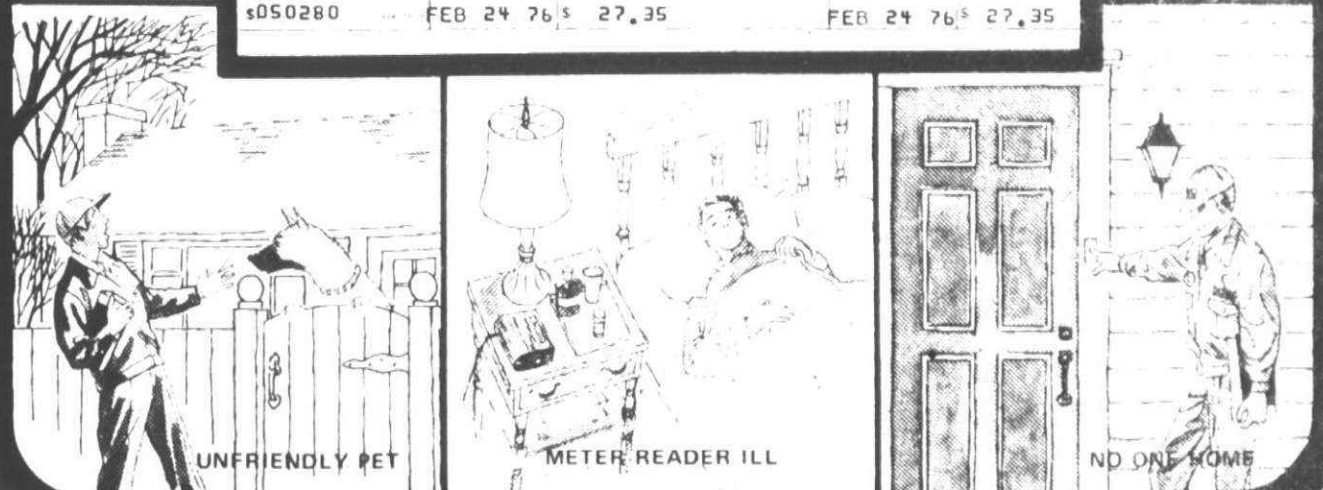
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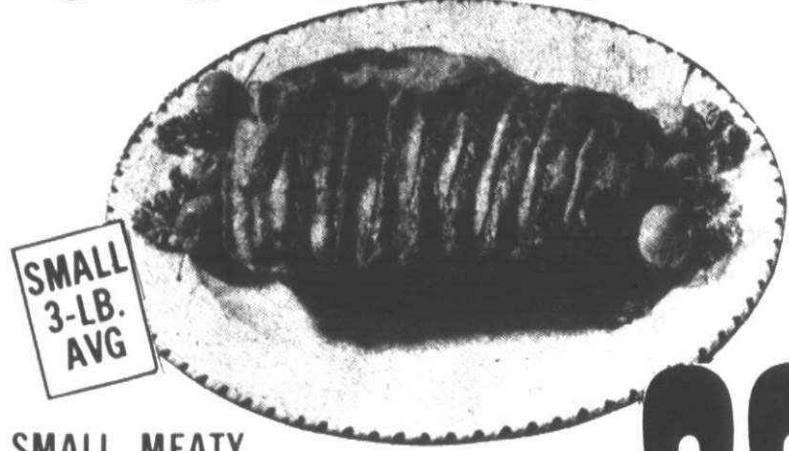
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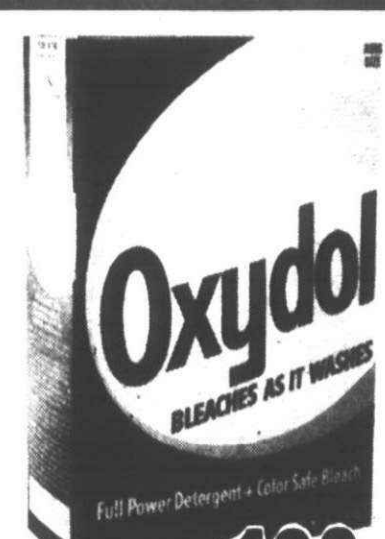
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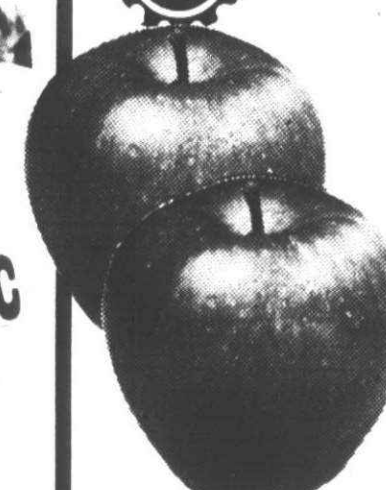
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Rock grapplers 2nd in Sub 8 league meet

Notching 90 team points, Plymouth-Salem's wrestlers took second at the Suburban-Eight League tourney behind the 105½ score earned by the first place and league champs Edsel Ford.

The Rocks had seven grapplers in the finals. Captain Carl Schultz lead the Rockmen, chalking up two falls before he decided Jaguar Paul Smith, 5-1, to take first at 129 pounds.

Burr had to default his championship match to Trenton's Mike Barnes because of an arm injury suffered when he beat Keith Sandy of Edsel Ford 8-5.

Also placing was Scott Bunn, taking a

fourth for Redford Union in the 135 division.

The only two Bulldogs that placed from Livonia Bentley both topped Plymouth-Salem Rockmen.

Taking first place honors at the 108 pound class, Scott McKay had two falls and then beat Les Hassen, 9-6. Later McKay's teammate Gary Hosey defeated Bob Zalimeni, 5-0, to place third.

If Plymouth Salem ever learned one lesson and learned it well from years of pitting sports wits and brawn against Livonia Bentley, it's that the Bulldogs won't roll over and play dead just at the sight of press clippings saying that the other guy probably has the better ball club.

Another familiar chapter in this continuing saga was written Tuesday night in the Bentley gym when a Bentley basketball team that gave no quarter and asked none gave Plymouth's No. 1 state-ranked Rocks absolute fits before succumbing, 56-43.

For the record, it was the 16th victory in a row for the unbeaten Rocks under Coach Fred Thomann, and put them at 10-0 in the Suburban Eight League standings with four games to go. Belleville is second at 8-2.

But there wasn't a Plymouth fan in the typically dimly lit Bentley gym who didn't fear that the bubble had burst when the Bulldogs led at halftime, 24-16.

After all, aren't 16 points hardly a single quarter's production for their beloved Rocks—who only that day had been rated Michigan's best Class A schoolboy team by both of the Detroit metropolitan dailies?

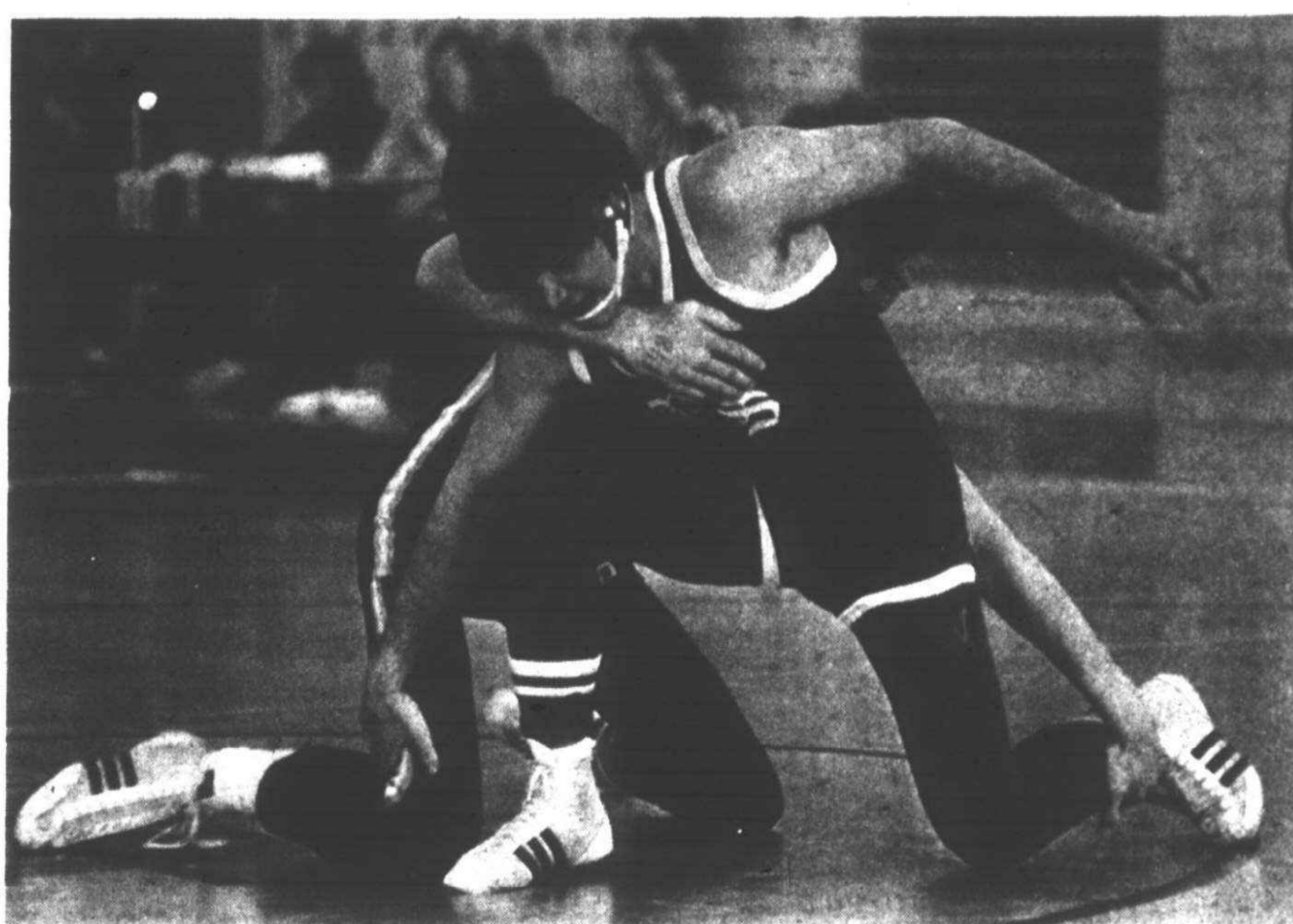
IT WAS NOT until then, and only then, that Plymouth was able to chalk out on the blackboard a way to penetrate the tricky defense devised by Bulldog coach Larry Jackson.

The Bentley mentor disdained every other defensive strategy used unsuccessfully against the Rocks this campaign to go man for man (Ed Snow and Clay Carlson) against Plymouth's two big gunners, Jim Ellinghausen and Brian Wolcott, and then surround the key with a triangular zone that could sag on the 6-8, all-state Ellinghausen whenever he went inside to the bucket.

Leads of 10-6 after the first period and 24-16 at the half on the balanced shooting of Snow, Carlson, Jim Rhodes and Craig Fuelling sent the Bentley fans into ecstasy.

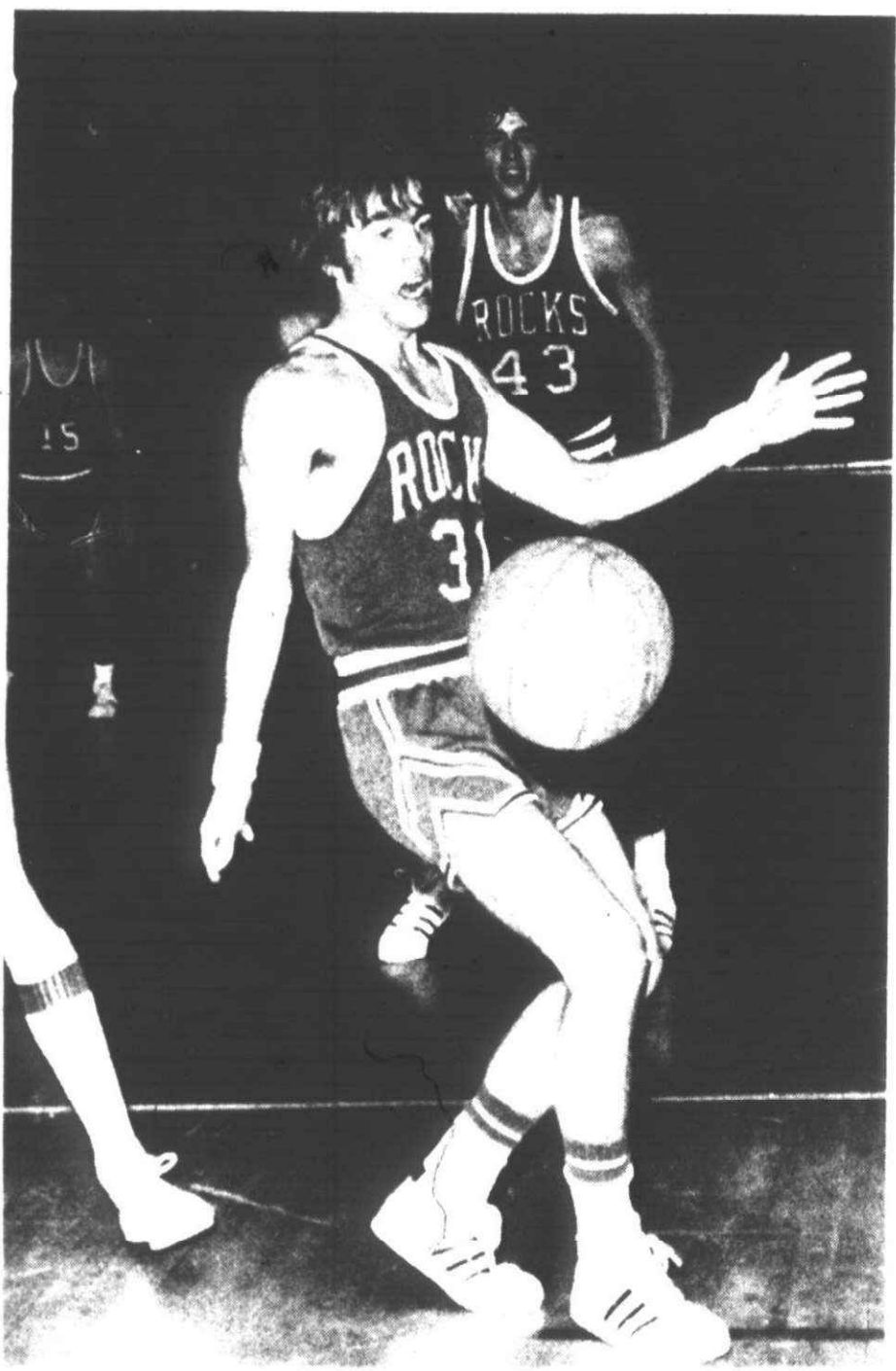
But, as the saying goes, that was all she wrote.

Chiefs blast Woodhaven

The Plymouth Canton Chiefs roared out to a 19-point first-quarter lead and then dominated their contest with the hapless Woodhaven Warriors, en route to a 79-51 victory.

The win broke a three-game losing streak for Canton as the Chiefs chalked up their third consecutive win over Woodhaven in three years.

Keith Osborne sat out the majority of the second half with Tom Close, as both senior guards topped Canton in scoring with 14 points apiece. All of Osborne's points came in the first half. Three other Chiefs breaking into double figures were all juniors.

Forward Mike Albright teamed up with guards Kevin Randazzo and Rob Mandie for 30 points, each player pumping home

SHE ATTEMPTS to hide the physical evidence of her guilt by covering her daughter's left hand with a mitten and keeping her at home. They move frequently, always one step ahead of the truant officer.

Ultimately, this situation is resolved in tragedy, but the author's real interest is in the torments and denials of human beings bound by guilts they can neither understand nor resist.

You will like 'As You Like It'

The "golden age." Shakespeare. The Victorian era. The early 1970s. They share an admiration for the pastoral life—an admiration that is continually defaced by reality and politics.

The four periods (or are they a single, flowing era?) are joyously combined in the Hilberry Theater Company's new production of "As You Like It," which will be in repertory until May 19.

If you're the type who promises himself to see something by Shakespeare one of these days, "As You Like It" should be the one. Wayne State University graduate students can be depended upon for consistently high quality and gusto in the theater at Cass and Hancock, and this production has to rank among their better offerings.

DIRECTOR Richard Spear has set Shakespeare's finest, most lucid and lofiest comedy in the Victorian era—an era which much admired this work.

With a simple stage setting, the play's visual center of attention is the dazzling costume work of Daniel Thomas Field and Helen Markovitch. Orlando, the young brother cheated of his inheritance and deprived of an education, comes off as a hayseed with longhairs, clodhoppers and gaudy-luses.

The Goddess Hymen, who appears in the final scene, alone is worth the price of admission. It would be unfair to describe her here. Suffice it to say she is entirely con-

sistent with Shakespeare's intention—to twist those who seek perfection in rustic simplicity, and at the same time not to hurt their feelings.

The 1970s touch is the music, composed by Hilberry Fellow Dennis Raze and performed on folk guitars. The contemporary harmonies strike you as out of place with the Victorian costumes only for a moment.

THIS IS THE story of Rosiland, the daughter of an exiled duke who herself is

exiled, and her sophisticated wooing of the simple Orlando in the forest of Arden.

Deborah Eckols adds a deliciously saucy note to one of the Bard's wittiest heroines, and you see dozens of little visual jokes that you couldn't see in the script.

John Michael Hosking's Touchstone is no longer a clown but a prestidigitator—a magician and pitchman as well as a comic philosopher. He's totally realistic, even when wooing the odoriferous Audrey, the goatherd (Harper Jane McAdoo).

If you have a Shakespeare edition or an old outline gathering dust in the house, it may help to review the maze of characters. If not, the Hilberry's newsletter outlines them quickly.

The talk is easy on the modern ear, there's no need to brush up on your 16th century English. Shakespeare intended this as a fun play, and that's the best way to view it.

'Holmes' opens at Fisher

The Broadway production of "Sherlock Holmes," starring Leonard Nimoy and Alan Sues, is at Detroit's Fisher Theater for a five-week engagement through March 13.

A national tour began Jan. 14, and Detroit is the third city on its route. A cast of 26, five sets, 40 tons of scenery and costumes and one of the most technical, complex productions ever to tour are said to be components of this Royal Shakespeare Company production.

The play is based on the 1899 collaboration of Arthur Conan Doyle and William Gillette. It is a dramatic spectacle which covers Holmes territory from Baker Street to the Steeple Gas Chamber—from Professor Moriarty's Lair to Dr. Watson's Kensington Consulting Room—and includes

London fog, trap doors, hidden elevators and secret passages galore.

The play had its first New York performance Nov. 6, 1899, at the Garrick Theatre starring William Gillette. The current revival is the first time it has been performed in the United States since its premiere in 1899.

This production has been a smash hit in both London and New York.

Two popular television stars play major roles in the touring company. Nimoy, beloved by millions of fans as Dr. Spock in "Star Trek," plays the title role of Holmes. Sues, who for four years appeared before television audiences as a zany member of "Laugh-In," plays the sinister Professor Moriarty. An assorted cast

of odd ball characters—good and evil—support the two stars.

Tickets are on sale at the Fisher box office.
