Ticket volume drops

State police troopers in midst of slowdown

An apparent slowdown by state police troopers is taking its toll on the number of tickets issued in the Plymouth, Northville and Canton area, but Lieutenant William Tomczyk, commander of the Plymouth sub-post assures residents the effect, if any, of the seeming slowdown is minimal.

The Observer & Eccentric learned of the unofficial slowdown late last week, when a trooper confirmed that state police officers were protesting for their right to collective bargaining.

Although there is a bill in the state legislature to allow for collective bargaining by state police, current state statutes do not allow troopers the right to normal bargaining procedures.

Tomczyk said he had not been confronted by any of his men concerning the unofficial slowdown, but he said he had heard of it "via the grapevine."

"The officers are dissatisfied in the metropolitan area because in many cases they are making \$2,000-\$3,000 less than local policemen, and I understand they want the right to collective bargaining," Tomczyk explained.

Troopers are also dissatisfied because there are no provisions in the pay scales allowing for areas where the cost of living is higher.

PAY SCALES, uniform throughout the state, begin at \$5.78 an hour for a trooper starting out, to a maximum of \$6.84 an hour after four years.

Annually, the scale is from \$10,700 to

\$14,280. Fringe benefits include hospitalization; a retirement plan after 25 years; sick days that accrue annually and can be carried forward; and life insurance.

By comparison, both the Plymouth police and the Wayne County Sheriff start men at about \$12,000. Maximum for a trooper on the road patrol is \$15,900, while for Plymouth police, it's \$16,600.

Benefits for the Plymouth police, in particular, are more substantial, and cost the department about another 35 per cent per man, according to police chief Tim Ford.

State troopers are expected to get a substantial raise in July, 75-81 cents per hour, but with raises expected for the sheriff and the Plymouth police in July also, state troopers will still not be on a par with local officers.

According to Ford, pay and benefit packages in the metropolitan area are better in some other areas, in particular Farmington Hills and Taylor.

WHILE THE SLOWDOWN in the Plymouth-Canton area has been minimal, other posts, particularly Pontiac, have been hard hit by the lack of action.

There, according to Tomczyk, officers have been issued counseling memos, although none have been suspended.

"Since I took over in October, 1974, there has been a steady decline in ticketing," explained Tomczyk. "We have never emphasized a quota system where you demand a certain amount of tickets from your men per shift."

"Instead, we have been concentrating on

complaints and increasing our exposure. We're trying to get maximum exposure."

Tomczyk said the post has been also been emphasizing arresting drunk drivers.

So far this year at the Plymouth sub-post, arrests of drunk drivers by state troopers has tripled, from 12 at this time last year to 36 for 1976.

But in other areas, the ticketing has declined.

"I've talked to some of my officers about sliding," said Tomczyk, "and since then, the performance has picked up."

"I don't really know what's happening with the thing. I don't know what you really gain with a slowdown. Maybe they think pressure can be brought to bear."

ACCORDING TO THE lieutenant, the peak of the slowdown occurred in mid-January and has since tailed off.

"There's really no need for public concern," he explained. "Accidents haven't increased, and we've ticketed more drunk drivers."

From two to six cars are on the road patrolling Plymouth, Northville and Canton area during a 24-hour day.

Backup at the Plymouth sub-post includes two detectives, a complaint officer, a court officer and a community service officer.

Regional bargaining effort considered

Teachers may join hands at table

A movement toward regional bargaining is expected to have strong impact on teacher contract negotiations which are now gearing up in Redford Union, South Redford, Garden City, Wayne-Westland and Plymouth.

Teachers from these districts, Livonia and 15 others in Wayne County, have entered the first phase of regional negotiations by forming a group called Regional Bargaining '76.

At the head of the regional organization sits Robert Zaetta, a science teacher at Hilbert Junior High School in Redford Union, who believes regional bargaining is the only efficient, effective way teachers can obtain fair contracts.

Zaetta, and many others, believe teachers have been sitting around the bargaining table minus one crucial tool—something which would force school boards to bargain in good faith. Their only tool, a strike, is illegal and public pressure generally ends up behind the school board.

TEACHERS THINK regional bargaining is the only way to go," said Zaetta. "They've been backed in a corner—witness what happened in Crestwood and Garden City."

"Look what's happened to teachers since 1968. We only had two good years of bargaining after we got the right to negotiate. After that we haven't even kept up with the cost of living."

That position will change, he believes, as Michigan Education Association affiliates in Wayne County move toward a unified group. Regional Bargaining '76 is "some-what of a misnomer," Zaetta says, noting that the teachers' ultimate goal is to get involved in human relations, public relations and political activity on a regional basis. He looks forward to the day when teacher unions exert considerable political pressure on the governor and state legislature in school matters.

"This is going to be the new arena for teachers in the future," he said. "It's our dear governor and his cohorts who have screwed up teachers and school systems in the state. We hope to get into strict accountability of the legislators."

ZAETTA RECOGNIZES that teachers

must take one step at a time—and regional bargaining is the first step. "Our ultimate goal is to bargain one contract at one table. We want to bargain the same wages, hours and conditions of employment for teachers."

Teachers are now in the second of a

three-phase program working toward that goal. The first step was taken when 21 of 25 MEA affiliates in Wayne County voted to join Regional Bargaining '76. Districts sent two teacher representatives to sit on the regional congress which is now engaged in the second step, drawing up a constitution.

The first draft of the constitution will be reviewed by the regional group April 2 and revisions made. The revised constitution then will be reviewed by each local union at special hearings and redrafted. "We don't want to rush on this," Zaetta said. "It's important that the local members have maximum input on this."

AFTER THAT a final constitution will be voted on. Teachers also will vote to unite as one bargaining unit with the Michigan Employment Relations Commission (MERC). Zaetta couldn't estimate when that vote will take place. "But I would think it will be by the end of the school year," he added.

In the meantime, contract negotiations will begin as planned in March and April in local districts.

Zaetta couldn't assess the impact of regional bargaining on this year's negotiations. Laws governing school negotiations "don't forbid" school boards to bargain on a regional basis, he said. "They are silent on it."

HE EXPECTS some bargaining this year to have a regional tone, while other negotiating may be strictly local. Zaetta also expects public pressure to eventually force boards to bargain regionally. "It will result in a tremendous cost saving to districts," he said, noting that many districts hire attorneys to negotiate and additional expenses are incurred in time spent by administrators around the bargaining table.

"What's important is that they will have to treat teachers as equals at the bargaining table," he said. "All we're asking for is equality."

'Moceri project,' now Mayfair, gets green light

The specter of the Moceri project, at one time one of the most controversial pro-

posed developments in the township, still lingers.

The nature of the project, which called for a 65-acre regional shopping center surrounded by 130 acres of various residential uses at the southwest corner of Joy and Sheldon, was eventually decided by a consent decree negotiated by Supervisor Robert Greenstein and representatives for Dominic Moceri, the developer.

Public sentiment ran very high against the project, and even though the planning commission recommended approval, the township board turned it down 3-2 in April 1974.

A lawsuit by Moceri followed and the consent decree followed negotiations between the township and Moceri.

The decree specifies the exact uses of the 195-acre parcel and stays with the land forever.

After the decree, ownership of the land changed hands. Dick Lewiston of Practical Homebuilders is now developing the land.

ON TUESDAY night, the planning commission gave preliminary plat approval to part of the project.

As specified by the consent judgment, Lewiston will develop the land almost entirely as a subdivision of single-family houses.

More than 460 single family houses will eventually be built on the site, although approval was granted Tuesday for the first phase only—some 289 lots.

Almost 35 acres under the court approved plan will be used for commercial, office, entertainment and general shopping.

Even though the consent judgment specifies how the land can be used, approval must be granted by both the township planning commission and board.

Planner Mike Manore explained, "The consent agreement set up the lot orientation and basically the platting. It's somewhat like a PUD (Planned Unit Development), but it is administered by the courts."

"But according to state statutes, the plats must still come before the planning commission before the developer can get under way."

THE OLD PROJECT called for substantial multiple development, including a high rise senior citizen home.

All multiple uses were scrapped in the consent decree along with the reduction in commercial uses.

Advantages to the new plan, according to Manore, include the development of Mor-

ton-Taylor Road by Lewiston from Joy Road to the southernmost edge of the property half a mile away.

Eventually, Morton-Taylor will run the length of the township.

The new plan also deeds right of ways so that both Joy and Sheldon can be widened, a move Manore says will be necessary in the future.

Commercial development in the parcel will be done in a cluster arrangement, with a multitude of small shops sharing a central mall.

"It's a new and attractive design," said Manore. "It won't be anything like a conventional shopping center. It won't look anything like Harvard Square."

ACCEPTANCE OF the first phase of the project, now called Mayfair, was coupled Tuesday with the rejection of a plan that would provide additional commercial acreage just west of the property across Sheldon. On that site, Brookeville Associates had asked for a rezoning to commercial to allow them to develop a similar cluster arrangement of shops on 20 acres.

That plan had been rejected earlier, and when the consent decree was signed,

Brookeville resubmitted the plan. By a vote of 5-0, the planning commission rejected the plan, with members citing different reasons for voting against the rezoning.

Manore recommended denial of the project because of the proximity of several commercial developments and commissioners Flossie Tonda and Bart Berg agreed, saying commercial interests already in the township should be protected.

Berg also said approval of the project would present the same traffic problems as if the Moceri project in its original form had been passed.

"If the Moceri project had been developed," Manore explained, "there might have been a reason to allow this change to commercial."

"Regional shopping centers like Westland or Livonia Mall attract a tremendous amount of traffic and there's a lot of spillover."

"Retailers like to cluster because it attracts more people and results in more sales; but with the current arrangements for Mayfair, commercial across Sheldon would probably be unwise."

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SHOP SAFETY

Plymouth schools active in accident prevention

The accidental death of a shop student in Farmington School District a few weeks ago has raised public attention about safety for equipment in vocational education classes.

For local parents wondering if a similar death could occur in the Plymouth Community School District, there are a number of assurances that it the likelihood isn't great.

"Whenever shop equipment is being operated, there's always the danger of injury or a mishap caused by human error or negligence," comments Supt. John M. Hoben when asked about the district's safety procedures for industrial arts equipment. "But I wouldn't expect such an accident wouldn't occur because of defective equipment. We are very careful to keep our shop equipment in safe, operating condition."

THE DEATH in Farmington involved a machine with a faulty switch which students were allowed to use. To turn the machine off, students would unplug it from the wall. The boy was electrocuted when trying to shut off the machine, which wasn't grounded properly.

As a matter of practice, industrial arts equipment is inspected on a continual basis at the high schools and middle schools in Plymouth Schools.

Each shop instructor, besides stressing safety to students, keeps a constant eye on equipment to make sure it remains in safe operating condition.

At many schools, this inspection process is a cooperative process. Maintenance men, cleaning the shops might notice a defect and report it immediately to the shop instructor. The building principal, or industrial arts coordinator, also keeps a close eye on the condition of equipment.

JAMES SYMONDS, director of maintenance and custodial operations, functions as a safety coordinator for the district.

The principals of each building are held responsible to Symonds for maintaining safe equipment, explains Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business.

"Shop teachers in each building, when they spot a problem, immediately bring it to the attention of their principal," explains Hoedel. "The problem is reported to Symonds, when it's serious, and he inspects and makes sure corrections are

made. Many minor defects, however, are corrected on the spot by the shop teacher."

Last November, Symonds inspected all shop facilities in the school district and ordered corrections where needed. He had been trained for inspections by MIOSHA (Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Act) inspectors on what state law requires.

"To the best of our ability," says Symonds, "we have identified and corrected all unsafe conditions."

Industrial arts shops must meet the requirements of the MIOSHA law. Since January, 1975, school districts have been covered by MIOSHA and are subject, at any time, to an announced visit by a MIOSHA team of inspectors. If any defect is noticed, the district receives an automatic fine. A return inspection is then made to insure that the problem has been corrected.

Last fall, for instance, the MIOSHA team made an announced visit to Plymouth Salem High and discovered a minor violation. The district was automatically fined (\$144) and subsequently reinspected.

BILL BROWN, principal of Salem, says the shop equipment is periodically checked by Patrick Fitzpatrick, industrial education coordinator at the high school.

"It's been a standard procedure here for years to regularly inspect our equipment," says Brown. "I have always insisted that we look at our equipment throughout the year as a continuous and on-going process."

As an example, Brown points out that there is presently a problem of water seepage because of construction at the Centennial Educational Park site. "The water seepage was near our welding shop and so we installed a sump pump device right away to avoid problems."

Hoedel says it's a standard practice for shop teachers, when spotting a problem, to immediately shut off a defective piece of equipment and make sure it isn't used until fixed. "This is part of teaching too. Students see by example that you just don't use machinery which isn't operating properly."

"The MIOSHA inspections provide a service to the school district, beyond what our staff does," adds Hoedel. "We don't

look at MIOSHA as a harassment but as a supplement to our efforts."

AN EXAMPLE of the stress on shop safety can be seen by visiting the shop at Pioneer Middle School taught by George Bachmann and Frank Brosnan.

"We push safety very, very hard with our students here," Brosnan stresses. "Some have said that there are no laws covering safety in the school industrial arts classes, but that's not at all true. We are covered by MIOSHA and must follow these guidelines."

"For instance, that law requires all students to wear safety goggles whenever operating a machine, which is just good sense anyhow. If a MIOSHA inspector dropped by and saw one student not wearing goggles, we'd get a citation. If fact, MIOSHA has the authority to close down a shop if it wants to."

"So our students wear safety goggles whenever operating equipment. And if George or I catch them without goggles on, we make the student write the section of the law requiring goggles 15 to 50 times."

At Pioneer, shop students see a lot of

safety movies. In addition, each student is required to take a safety test for which he must earn a 100 per cent score. Once the test is completed, the student takes it home for his parents' signature and returns it to the shop instructor.

The first week of school is devoted entirely to lectures on safety precautions and discussion of shop regulations. "We are very thorough and cover a lot of things," says Brosnan, "such as the rule against standing behind a student operating equipment; a common sense rule against hitting a wood chisel with a metal hammer. We also caution students about having loose fitting sleeves or baggy clothes on while near equipment."

"Anytime we spot defective equipment we immediately shut off the machine and leave it off until fixed. Just this week we spotted a problem on our jigsaw and I cut the plug wire in half so it couldn't be used."

Brosnan and Bachmann are just two examples of shop teachers in the district who place a lot of stress on safety, says Hoben. "Accidents can happen, especially when machine operators are careless, but thus far we have been very fortunate."

Classroom study draws W-W teachers

Wayne-Westland teachers are participating in a nationwide study of classroom teachers' needs which is intended to improve the quality of education now offered in schools.

The study, Teacher Instructional Needs Assessment, is being sponsored by the curriculum committee of the Wayne-Westland Education Association (WWEA) and involves about 250,000 teachers in 24 states.

W-W teachers will be asked to rate 60 statements about education in terms of how they currently apply and how teachers feel they should apply. A weighted discrepancy between what "is" and what "should be" will allow the WWEA to determine what areas teachers feel are most important for future considerations.

"Results of this needs assessment will be of great value in Wayne-Westland," Bill Reece, WWEA, president, said.

"It will give teachers, school administrators and the community an accurate picture of how teachers feel about instructional materials, in-service education, employment of support personnel, class size, grading practices, discipline procedures,

and methods of instruction."

Other areas include: physical facilities, teacher evaluation, communication, and "a host of other things that affect our abilities to teach to our fullest potentials."

"It will provide an excellent opportunity for us to evaluate how we might improve education at the system's most critical point—the classroom."

Assessment forms will be returned to the headquarters of the National Education Association for tabulation.

Reece said that while the assessment touches on the basics of instruction, he doesn't feel that improvements in education necessarily have to mean added cost to the taxpayer.

"For example, depending on findings, in-service education topics could be arranged to meet needs that teachers feel are more important than those now dealt with."

"Some aspects of the curriculum could be considered for revision. Discipline practices might be changed; student evaluations modified."

"We are excited about seeing the results."

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Survey underlines counselors' shortcomings

As a result of a survey implemented by administrators of the Wayne-Westland Community School District, students, teachers, and parents can expect a change in counseling services within the district.

The Guidance and Counseling Assessment study, presented to the board of education on Feb. 9, indicated the need for re-assessment of priorities in the student-counselor relationship.

The 18-question survey was distributed among all administrators, counselors and teachers. A random sample of 10 per cent was pulled for parents and students.

Elementary, special education, and home-study students were excluded from the survey because these groups require specialized counseling services.

WHEN ASKED to list in order of importance the tasks the respondent feels should be high in priority for a counselor, the most common answer was "personal problem counseling" among students, teachers, parents, administrators and the counselors themselves.

Among the students, records and scheduling was the second priority, with help for school-related problems (academic) as the third priority. Junior high students felt

that assistance in course selection was next on the list, while high school students appeared more concerned with career counseling.

A consensus indicated there should be increased availability of counselors for dealing with students' personal problems. One recommendation derived from the survey called for counselors to increase their services for personal-social counseling, but as the survey indicated, this cannot be done until counselors are freed from an overwhelming work load.

Presently, the district does provide counselors with in-service training including career guidance group counseling, laws affecting the juvenile, gestalt therapy, helping runaways, suicidal youngsters and children of alcoholic parents.

Increased positive parental contact has also been suggested. Counselors could work directly with parents of students, either in group counseling or on a one-to-one basis.

RECOMMENDATIONS for next school year's counselor services call for development of a counseling service brochure to be available to students, parents and administrators, as well as a media presentation describing the junior and senior high school counseling services to be used in community presentation.

A review of the counselor's job description, as a means of re-directing priorities, and more counselor involvement in community programs and activities will also be encouraged.

The report concluded that as a result of the survey, teachers, counselors, and administrators are more attuned to the needs of the various populations, and the directions they must collectively pursue in order to provide services to which the community is entitled.

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Bike days on Hines Drive are jeopardized this year

"Bike days" on the E.N. Hines Parkway are in jeopardy this year, says State Rep. John Markes, who originated the idea in 1973.

Markes (D-Westland) said that so far the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has yet to act on the request to close Hines Drive to motor vehicle traffic four days during the year.

The County Road Commission, which has jurisdiction over the drive and park, has approved the bike days, but there is a tangle with the board of commissioners, which handles the general fund budget.

COUNTY COMMISSIONER Mary Dumas (R-Livonia) gave this explanation of the problem:

"In the past, the road commission OK'd it, and then the sheriff came in with an overtime bill after the bike days were held." The sheriff's department polices the drive.

"Last year we told the sheriff—and I did, too—would they please come to the board of commissioners ahead of time so the policing could be arranged by scheduling instead of paid for in overtime."

MARKEST PUT the cost of bike days at \$3,568, and that is another problem in 1976.

The county general fund was socked by the so-called jail crisis. The county must scrape up \$1.5 million to pay for renovations and a jail annex to meet terms of a court order designed to correct poor jail conditions.

Mrs. Dumas said the county commissioners are asking the road commission to put up the money for bike days this year.

The road commission builds and maintains county roads out of state gasoline and weight tax returns. The road commission also operates parks, but it gets its maintenance funds from the county general fund.

IN PAST YEARS, said Markes, the road

commission and the county board "would concur with the request in December. Armed with the approval, I would now normally have sent requests to each local government, seeking the necessary resolutions authorizing the closing of Hines Drive."

"In past years, communications seeking the cooperation of all concerned departments of police, fire and road maintenance would now be in the mail. Not this year."

Markes added in a letter to Mrs. Dumas: "I'm also convinced that one of the reasons that the events have been successful is that the whole effort is coordinated through one office and kept as simple as possible."

He added: "I still think that's true."

Heart attack victims needed to aid research

If you've suffered a heart attack in the last five years, you could help medical researchers determine whether common aspirin can prevent recurring heart attacks. Doctors at Henry Ford Hospital are look-

ing for 75 more participants in a nationwide study of the drug's effectiveness.

Men and women between the ages of 30-69, who have sustained a documented heart attack no less than eight weeks or more than 60 months before entering the study, are eligible.

AN ESTIMATED 1.5 million heart attacks, about half of them fatal, occur each year in the United States. The aims of the Aspirin-Myocardial Infarction Study (AMIS) are to determine whether, and to what extent, regular administration of one gram of aspirin daily over a three-year period will reduce mortality rates and reduce the threat of recurrent heart attacks or stroke.

Dr. Sidney Goldstein of Bloomfield Hills is the AMIS principal investigator and Henry Ford Hospital's cardiovascular disease division head.

He explains that blood clotting plays a major role in both the early and late stages of coronary artery occlusion and that "clumping" is a large component in the formation of blood clots.

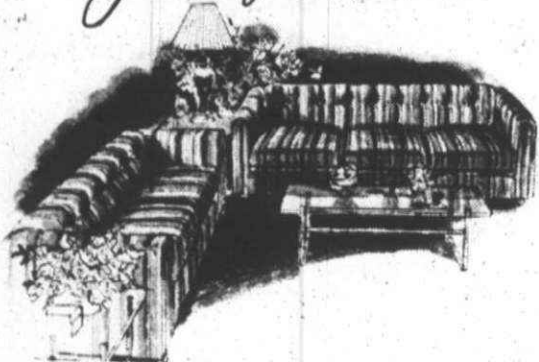
Individuals or physician-referred patients interested in participating should contact Dr. Goldstein at 876-2121.

The hospital will not medically treat participants, but will make available any and all laboratory data collected on their patients to physicians.

"The study is being conducted on a controlled scientific basis," Dr. Goldstein cautions. "The average person should not take aspirin at random for prevention of heart disease. Too much aspirin will have the effect of causing bleeding stomach ulcers."

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If you will it, you can move things

As I promised you last week, here are a few simple experiments you may wish to try to test your psychokinetic powers. These may be tried all by yourself or with a group of friends.

If several people are participating in the experiment, however, be sure that they are all serious and open-minded about it. One strong mind opposing the experiment

can hamper the strength of the others taking part.

IF YOU have a hanging lamp or plant in your home, you may use it for the first experiment. If not, then create a sort of pendulum by tying a weight to the end of a string and suspend it from the ceiling.

Seat yourself in a comfortable position. Relax completely and stare at the hanging object. Remaining completely relaxed, and with your will, make that object move. Expect it to begin moving. Don't become strained, but simply will it to move and believe that it will do so. Continue to stare at it until it does.

When it begins to move, don't stop, but will it to swing in a larger and larger arc until there remains no doubt in your mind that it is moving in response to your will and you are controlling it.

ANOTHER TEST consists of placing a Boston rocker in the center of the floor, away from the walls and all furniture. Seat yourself comfortably some distance away, but where your view of the rocker is unobstructed. Then will that chair to begin rocking. Don't become excited or uptight. Just remain relaxed, and calmly look at the rocker. Will it; command it mentally to begin rocking.

If you are not successful the first time you try this, don't give up. Try it again the next day, and the next. Expect it to rock and it will. You will be surprised how practice improves your control.

YOU WILL need to prepare a few simple materials for the third experiment: a common straight pin, a one-inch square of cardboard, a one-inch square of paper and a large, clear glass water tumbler or brandy sniffer.



First, push the straight pin through the center of the cardboard. Place it on a flat surface so that the point is straight up in the air.

Next, fold the paper diagonally. Unfold it, and fold it again diagonally the other way. Unfold it, and lightly pinch the center of the paper so that it forms a small umbrella. Balance this paper umbrella lightly on the pin point. Do not pierce the pin through the paper. When finished, it should look like this:



Place the glass upside down over the umbrella to protect it from drafts.

Gaze through the glass at the paper and use your will to move it. When it begins spinning, then use your psychokinetic power to stop it. With practice, you should be able to make it whirl clockwise or counter-clockwise, stop and start at your mental command.

Local history now on sale

The first book-length history of Plymouth, written by Sam Hudson, is now on sale in the Plymouth Historical Museum.

Also covered are the tragic Salem train wreck of 1907, Carry Nation's visit in 1908, the 1920 lawsuit which challenged the right to hold office of Judge Phoebe Patterson (Michigan's first woman justice of the peace) and the community's own "civil war" when the city commission was recalled in 1949.

Hudson, a part-time instructor in English at Schoolcraft College in Livonia, has donated all proceeds from the book, which sells at \$7.25, to the Plymouth Historical Society.

Many of the articles—although not all—have appeared over the years in the Plymouth Past & Present historical column he writes for the Observer & Eccentric.

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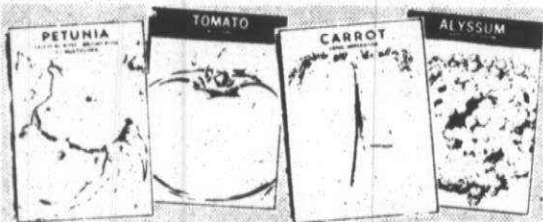

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State OK's 34-mile biking trail

A 34-mile bike and hiking trail in Livingston and Jackson counties is in the works.

The State Highway Commission authorized acquisition, at a price to be negotiated, of an abandoned Grand Trunk Western Railroad right of way.

The starting point would be Lakeland, south of Brighton. To find it on the map, let your finger run westward along Ten Mile, nine miles past South Lyon into Liv-

ington County. If you can't spot Lakeland, look for Zukey Lake.

End point would be just north of I-94 near Jackson. The trail will pass Waterloo, Pinckney and Brighton state recreation areas.

Tracks and ties have been removed, but all bridges are still in place.

Limestone or bituminous material will be used to pave the path. Separate paths will be provided for horseback riders and hikers.

Funds will come from the U.S. Bureau of Outdoor Recreation by way of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the highway department's own fund for non-motorized transportation.

This is the second link in a cross-state bike path to be announced. Development of a 38-mile link from Kalamazoo to South Haven was announced earlier and is expected to begin this year.

No timetable has been announced for the Lakeland-Jackson link.

WINTERKILL is a possibility on inland lakes, especially shallow ones, this year.

Thick ice and deep snow on lake ice result in low levels of dissolved oxygen.



Aquatic plants don't flourish, and that results in their giving off less oxygen. Plants die and decompose, further reducing the oxygen supply.

He adds that the marking system "is often not too useful for the motorist because many accidents occur at night, and signs are so close to the crossing that the car is at the crossing at the same time the motorist becomes aware of the sign."

Painting returns to its proper home

"It finally came home." Mother Columbine, head of the Felician Sisters, sighed with relief as she gazed at a painting of St. Joseph and the Christ Child.

Such a painting had hung in the mother house when the Felician order was established in 1874 in Wisconsin.

How a similar painting recently returned to the Livonia mother house delights the smiling Mother Columbine.

IT WAS a circuitous route and a mysterious one as well.

Olof Wahlstrom of Plymouth bought the painting and a lot of other items at an estate auction in Detroit some years ago. Whose estate it was and when the auction was held, he can't recall.

With the nation's bicentennial intensifying historical research, Wahlstrom recently donated a book, some old maps dating back to 1830 and the painting to the Plymouth Historical Museum archives.

Mobile home gripes can be sent to builder

Attorney General Frank J. Kelley recommends that mobile home owners who have gripes about the construction or fire protection in their homes file warranty claims with the manufacturer, not the dealer.

Other complaints may be directed to either the manufacturer, the dealer, or both, he added.

Kelley, in a formal opinion requested last November by Sen. William Faust (D-Westland) said a complaint must be filed within a year and 10 days after delivery.

Faust had asked whether customers must decide whether the dealer or manufacturer is at fault and if damages could then only be collected from the company against whom a claim was made.

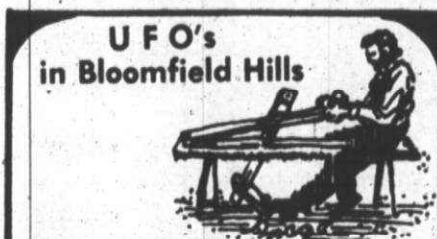
The attorney general suggested making claims against both the manufacturer and dealer because fault is sometimes difficult to determine and the sometimes urgent need to make notification before a warranty expires.

"It is extremely frustrating to file a warranty claim only to find out the guarantee expired a few weeks, or even days, ago," Kelley said.

"By keeping informed about their rights and responsibilities, consumers can avoid this."

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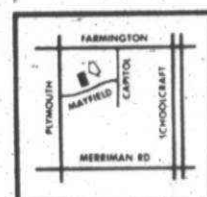
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Group suffers from an illusion of power

Concerned Parents appears ready to speed up its campaign against modular scheduling at Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP).

The group began its efforts with a survey of public opinion toward the method of scheduling classes at both high schools. Now Concerned Parents is considering legal action against the district, running two candidates for the school board in June, and possibly starting a recall campaign against at least two other trustees.

This newspaper supports the right of citizen dissent as a healthy ingredient in the democratic process. Sometimes it is not sufficient for citizens to mobilize only at election time to pick their representatives. The above methods are among the tools rightfully available to citizens who wish to express their dissatisfaction—be it against the school district, city or township government.

A PROBLEM of perspective, however, has entered into the escalation of Concerned Parents' campaign against modular scheduling.

Frankly, Concerned Parents is suffering from an illusion of power. The group perceives it represents a majority of parents and taxpayers. The figures from Concerned Parents, however, fail to

indicate that the group is anywhere near representing a majority.

Based on the numbers attending the group's public meetings, the active following is somewhere between 500 and 800. According to the survey taken by Concerned Parents, about 2,100 individuals in the school district are opposed to modular scheduling.

For argument's sake, assume there are persons sympathetic to Concerned Parents' cause who didn't respond to the survey. (Many may not have responded because they were unsympathetic.) Let's double the number who responded on the survey and use this as a liberal estimate of the group's following. This would mean Concerned Parents represent 4,200 persons—parents, taxpayers, voters alike.

THERE IS NO EASY way to come up with a rough estimate of representation among taxpayers because not all taxpayers are registered

to vote and not all adult members of the population pay property taxes; many rent.

It would be even tougher to estimate the percentage of parents with students attending high school that Concerned Parents represents. But using its survey and the numbers who attend the group's public meetings, its representation would be between 11 and 20 per cent. (Figure 3,700 students at CEP multiplied by 1½ parents per student equals 5,550 parents of whom 700 to 1,000 are supporters of Concerned Parents).

THE REASON it is important to point out these figures, and suggest that Concerned Parents is suffering from an illusion of power, is that recent statements against the school board have been short of reality.

Concerned Parents berates the need for a university evaluation of modular scheduling, questions the need for a citizens committee to study class scheduling and accuses the board of flaunt-

ing the wishes of residents by failing to abolish or modify immediately modular scheduling.

Concerned Parents may believe it represents a majority when in fact the group hasn't established that it represents a majority of either parents of high school students, parents of any kind, voters or taxpayers.

In delaying a decision on the future of modular scheduling until a citizens committee can make a recommendation, the board is attempting to determine what is best for the majority. The same is true of the evaluation by Wayne State University.

While it is quite proper to argue against modular scheduling, if one wishes to, it is quite another thing to claim a governmental agency is deliberately ignoring the majority of its constituents because it doesn't respond immediately to demands of one lobbying group.

The debate should continue. Concerned Parents should do its thing, and the issue should be aired fully in the community. But the community should be aware that Concerned Parents doesn't yet represent a majority and uses the word loosely when it claims it does.

Senate rumor mill goes to work on Esch, O'Hara

Try this rumor on for size: U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch is going to drop out of the Republican Senate race. Reason: There are so many candidates splitting up the regular party vote that conservative Bob Huber is likely to take it.

Try another, one: U.S. Rep. James O'Hara is going to drop out of the Democratic Senate race if Secretary of State Richard Austin gets in. Reason: There are so many white candidates that Austin, as a black with some labor support, is likely to take it.

BOTH TALES surfaced last week, and both were vigorously denied by the candidates or their spokesmen. The noteworthy thing is that Esch and O'Hara must be considered the front runners in their respective parties, and each is the most experienced candidate on either side of the aisle.

If they stay in, Michigan voters will have the biggest brawl in the September primary they've had in years. The kinds of crossovers we saw in the Republican senatorial primary of 1970 and the Democratic presidential primary of '72 will be non-existent.

ESCH, AN ANN Arbor resident whose 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth, must be considered the darling of the party establishment. That Max Fisher is in his financial camp is extremely significant.

The rumor that Esch will pull out seems to have emanated from Democratic State Chairman Morley Winograd and is being pushed by other Democrats. Esch's camp scoffs at it.

But Esch has allegedly failed to excite voters—which is a matter of opinion. And he has failed to scare off rival candidates—and that's a fact.

There's Huber, a one-term congressman. There's former Supreme Court Justice Tom Brennan, with his Irish name and unwillingness to commit himself on issues (and his messy resignation from the court because of his involvement with a private law school).

There's Deane Baker, a University of Michigan regent, rich enough to finance his own campaigns.

Tim Richard writes

And there's Lew Engman, Grand Rapids lawyer and former chairman of the Federal Trade Commission.

ANYONE BUT Baker has a reasonable shot at the nomination in a wide-open race, but Engman is the puzzler.

Ever since I knew him in college, Engman's style has been to move next to someone in power, impress them (he's academically brilliant) and pull off a plum by appointment.

From a Grand Rapids law practice, he went to the White House staff under John Ehrlichman, kept his nose clean of Watergate and landed the chairmanship of the FTC. It brought him Time Magazine's rating of one of the 40 outstanding young men in the country, but it didn't give him any kind of power base to run for the Senate.

So what's he doing in a race with the heavyweights? Lew simply doesn't make dumb mistakes, and he's got to have something up his sleeve. Will he back off the Senate race and go for the House in Jerry Ford's old 5th District? Attorney general in '78?

O'HARA, A SUBURBANITE from Utica, has great credentials as a UAW liberal and the support of veteran Democratic congressmen. He works inch by inch toward big goals.

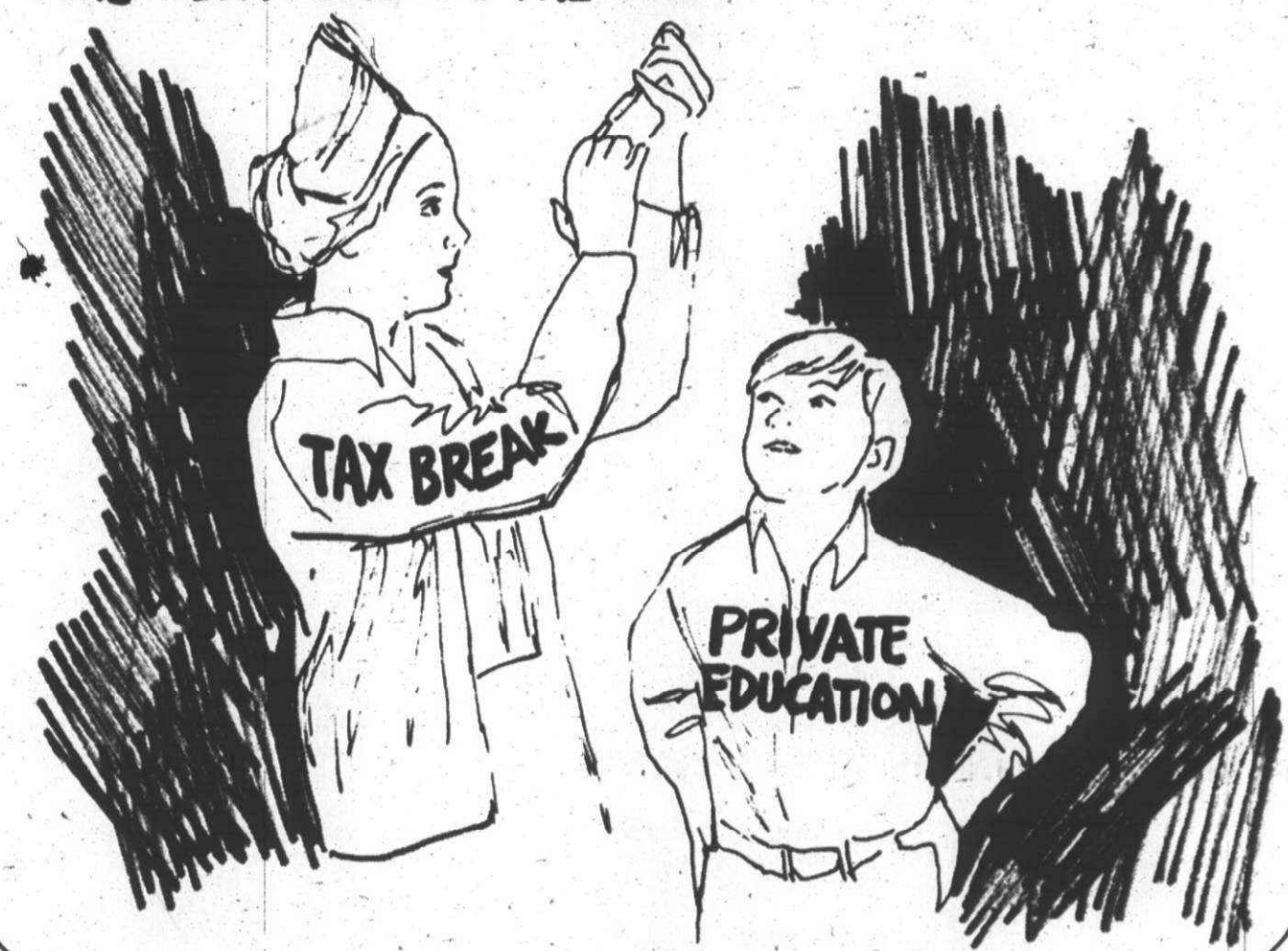
The charismatic Rep. Don Riegle of Flint will excite young voters and independents, but they are scarce in party primaries.

State Sen. John Otterbacher of Grand Rapids is a bright young chap that no one can figure out. Bloomfield Township lawyer Jim Elmsman's candidacy is being ignored by most political writers.

And Austin? A senior citizen. No record as a legislator. But plenty of exposure in his current job. A cautious, likeable accountant.

Political parties talk about open primaries but secretly loathe them because they can be so expensive and bloody. If Esch and O'Hara don't drop out, perhaps others will.

Private schools do public a favor, deserve a break

Pity the plight of private education. Every time public school teachers negotiate a raise in salaries, private schools have to have to attempt to be competitive and match that raise.

The problem, however, is that the public school system can go to the voters and ask for increased property tax millages to cover the cost. They also have such things going for them as state aid, federal aid and automatic revenue increases when the property assessors periodically reassess upward the value of the homes in a district.

IT IS EASY to say private schools can raise their tuition, but the plain facts of life are that most private schools have reached the point where any substantial increase in tuition will mean a substantial decrease in enrollment.

Slowly but surely, even those schools with out-of-sight tuitions and great endowments are being strangled to death by conditions over which they have no control. The only answer for life is for continued charitable support by individuals to help support private education.

IF THIS PRIVATE support is not continued, in the long run it will cost the taxpayers many more dollars because those students who are now being educated in the private sector would then have to be educated in the public sector, causing greatly increased costs to the local school systems.

There were some rumblings a couple of years ago that there should be some limitation on deductions for charitable giving because these deductions allowed some high-income people to reduce their taxes. This idea was quickly scrapped when the tax planners realized how much more it would

cost the government to provide social services if there were no charitable organizations around.

THE CONVERSE PHILOSOPHY is now true. Bills have been introduced in Congress to allow people to use the tuition paid to private education as a deduction for income tax purposes because it might, in the long run, be the only way private education can be supported.

Obviously, any deduction reduces the tax intake for the government. But if something isn't done for private education, over the long term the cost to the government will be vastly more than the impact of a tax deduction.

THERE IS JUSTICE in allowing such a tax deduction because the people who are sending their children to public schools are deducting the tuition for their children through the payment of their property taxes.

Those parents who elect to send their children to private schools are also paying their fair share through taxes without burdening the public school system with additional students.

If more clear thinking on the subject is not done shortly, and action taken, private education could slip from the scene, losing us all a great educational asset.



Our Schools Today

(The following column providing information about Plymouth Community School District is written by Florence Beier, community relations director for the district. Residents with questions they would like answered in this column may contact Mrs. Beier at 453-0200.)

Welcome to the meeting of the board of education of the Plymouth Community School District. That's right—welcome! All official meetings of the school board are open to the public, by law, policy, and desire of the members. Citizens are encouraged to attend, and efforts are made to make them comfortable.

ALL REGULAR school board meetings are held in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High School at Joy and Canton Center Roads. Meetings start at 7:30 p.m. on the first, second and fourth Monday of each month.

Ample parking is available directly in front of the school. The board meets in a large two-level room with chairs and tables for the audience. The members of the board sit at a long table facing the public with signs identifying each member by name. They are flanked by administrators who present reports or answer questions from board members.

All discussion is carried on through microphones and a public address system so that the audience can hear easily.

To make the proceedings clear to everyone, copies of the agenda for that meeting are available at the entrance to the cafeteria. You also may pick up an explanation

of the procedure for addressing the board. A microphone is provided for citizens who wish to speak during the half-hour set aside at each meeting for comments from the community.

NEWSPAPER reporters have a table near the front of the room, with a sign showing which publication they represent. They frequently remain after the formal meeting to ask for clarification or additional details to include in their stories on the meeting.

Coffee is provided for the audience and press as well as for board members. However, smoking is not permitted in the high school cafeteria.

Visitors to school board meetings should be aware of one detail: To conserve energy and cut utility costs, all district buildings thermostats are set at 68. The Plymouth Canton High cafeteria is sometimes rather chilly on cold winter evenings.

Pursell to study communication

State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) has been invited to serve on the National Conference of State Legislatures' legislative information needs committee for 1976.

The committee is primarily concerned with improving communication to and among state legislatures. Among other things, it will be working on a centralized computer system to keep legislators

THE BOARD of education conducts its meetings by Roberts Rules of Order, the same procedure one finds in most formal meetings. This involves making and seconding motions, and so on. Four members of the seven must be present to vote on any decision.

Discussions are sometimes quite heated and lengthy. At other times the board can reach an accord quickly. The meetings adjourn after one to four hours.

The board of education holds study sessions and workshops at other times and places. These also are open to the public. Sometimes closed executive sessions are held for personnel or legal matters, but no official votes can be taken except at regular meetings.

Major decisions affecting our children are made by the board of education whom we elect to represent us. The more we know about how they decide, the better we can participate. Probably the best way to stay informed is to attend the meetings.

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1/2-mill tax eyed for SC projects

Slightly more than one-half mill may be added to property owners' tax bills in the Schoolcraft College district without the taxpayers' nod.

Five members of the Schoolcraft Board of Trustees indicated at a Feb. 11 study session that they favor adding 53 cents per \$1,000 of equalized property value to tax bills by board resolution. One member was opposed, one had reservations and one—Archibald Vallier—was absent and not expected to return for the Feb. 25 meeting when the issue will be decided.

The 0.53 mill increase would be in addition to the 1.77 mills approved by voters. A total tax of \$2.30 for every \$1,000 of equalized property value would be required of every property owner for college operations.

THE INCREASE is needed, according to W. Kenneth Lindner, vice-president for administrative affairs, to maintain current operations and for some improvements.

Five projects—the Learning Resources Center, the present Culinary Arts addition,

the Applied Science building addition, the Waterman Campus Center addition and an engineering study for future campus development—would require a \$5 million bond issue and an annual 2 1/4 cent per \$1,000 equalized property value tax for repayment.

According to Lindner, the board has four alternatives:

- Levy the full 1.77 mills now voted to the college for operations and eliminate allocations for special funds.
- Levy 1.77 mills for operations and request a special 0.16 mill for five years for special funds.
- Levy a 0.53 mill all-purpose increase for five years.
- Levy an additional 0.53 mill in perpetuity.

RECENT COURT decisions have allowed boards of education to levy bond issues in addition to millage approved by voters.

Although the board agrees that a millage increase is necessary, there is some dis-

Transit tops SEMCOG agenda

Transportation, sewer maps, services for the elderly, and bicycles will top the agenda of the Feb. 20 executive committee meeting of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

SEMCOG delegates will be asked to vote on proposed transportation plans for the Port Huron, Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti areas.

The Port Huron plan calls for improvements in highways with recommendations for additional work in the transit and bike-way systems.

The Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti plans present a detailed highway-transit and bike-way for the areas.

Also, delegates are expected to vote on a regional bikeway plan which addresses current and projected bicycle patterns for public use.

If adopted, these plans will become part of SEMCOG's 1990 regional transportation plan.

SEMCOG's Council on Environmental

Strategy will ask delegates to vote on amendments to SEMCOG's sewer-water-storm Drainage plan. If adopted, the amendments will retain four of nine regional sewer maps and eliminate the remaining five.

Also up for a vote at the Feb. 20 meeting is a proposed agreement between SEMCOG and the two area agencies on aging in southeast Michigan. The agreement would specify SEMCOG's responsibilities to these agencies and would focus on: how the agencies can use federal grant reviews for programs for the elderly; sharing regional information; and how members of the agencies' advisory committee should be selected.

In other business the nominating committee is expected to present a slate of nominations for SEMCOG 1976 officers. The executive committee meeting will be held Friday, Feb. 20 at the Northland Inn, 21000 Northwestern Highway, Southfield at 2 p.m.

Water rate hearing set

A public hearing on water rate increases has been called by the Detroit Board of Water Commissioners at 10 a.m. Feb. 24 in the 13th floor City-County Building auditorium.

According to Charles R. Scales Jr., director of the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, factors leading to the increase in water rates and how the increase will affect individual billings will be discussed. Public comments and questions also will be discussed.

The new rates are scheduled to be effective May 1.

PERSONS OR groups giving oral presentations are urged to be brief to allow all parties to participate. They are also asked to submit a copy of their presentation in writing for the record of the water board.

Scales said the amount of the rate increase was 39 per cent and applied to both retail and wholesale customers.

FOR AREA communities the new quoted average wholesale rate per 1,000 cubic feet of water, without individual community add-ons, are:

Southeastern Oakland County Water Authority (SEOCWA), \$1.63; Bloomfield Hills, \$2.96; Farmington, \$2.28; Farmington Hills, \$2.53; Garden City, \$2.21; Lathrup Village, SEOCWA; Livonia, \$2.21; Plymouth, \$2.66; Southfield, SEOCWA; Troy, \$2.64; Westland, \$2.21; Beverly Hills, SEOCWA; Avon Township, \$3.11; Bloomfield Township, \$2.95; Canton Township, \$2.50; Plymouth Township, \$2.66; Redford Township, \$1.96; and West Bloomfield Township, \$2.93.

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If someone asks you to join a money-making plan involving chain letters and U.S. Savings Bonds, you'd better refuse.

You aren't likely to make any money — it's more likely you'll lose your "investment" to get in on the deal — and it's possible you may be prosecuted for violation of federal, state or local laws.

A few months ago, a number of end-less-chain schemes were launched in Southern California. The intermingling organizations were active under several misleading names — "Your March of Bonds," "Inflation Defense Foundation," "Century Club," "Exclusive One Million, Inc.," "Uncle Sam Investment, Inc.," "Six-Pack Club."

The scheme most often used worked this way — the victim became an "active member" by paying \$37.50 to a "sponsor". In return, he received a

membership list of 10 names and a \$25 savings bond, recently purchased for \$18.75, made payable to the first person on the list.

THE NEW "member" made two new membership lists, crossing off the top name on the original list and adding his own name at the bottom. He then purchased two \$25 bonds, payable to the person who was then first on the lists. He delivered the bond that came with the first list to the person named — personally or by mail.

As a "new member", he was required to pay annual dues of \$3 and to purchase membership books, at \$1.50 each, to give to the two "new members" he brought into the scheme. The victim had spent \$81, but was told he would recover most of his investment when he sold his two lists. He did, in fact, recover \$75, if he was able to do so.

However, for one member to re-

ceive \$19,200 — the promised windfall — 1,024 new members would have had to join after he did, without the chain's being broken. To achieve optimum success, the schemes required a membership of 250 times the entire population of the world.

Since the membership lists were originally prepared by the promoters — with their names and addresses or those of their associates heading the lists — the scheme would provide bonds for the promoters long before — if ever — new members reaped any harvest.

THE PROMOTERS of that plan used two variations — the "Six Pack," involving lists with only six names, and the "Century Club," which used \$100 Bonds, in lieu of \$25 Bonds.

Rather than circulate the lists of the bonds through the mails, those promoters relied upon meetings in private homes to further their schemes. Had the mails been used, the promoters would have been in violation of the U.S. Code, Title 18, Section 1302 — the "lottery" statute — which proscribes the mailing of material concerning a lottery promotion.

It establishes criminal sanctions of a \$1,000 fine or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both, upon conviction. They would also have been in violation of Section 1341 — the

"mail fraud" statute.

Most of the "bottom-liners" involved in such schemes are relatively innocent of wrongdoing. They have no intention of perpetrating a fraudulent scheme or otherwise using the mails illegally. In addition to the promise of a dollar reward, they are often persuaded that they are being "patriotic" — helping their government's savings bonds program.

OVER THE YEARS, the Department of the Treasury has advised the public that chain-letter schemes involving savings bonds — which are essentially get-rich-quick endeavors — do a distinct disservice to the savings bonds program. Instead of encouraging individuals to develop genuine savings plans, they create the illusion that participants are both aiding their government and themselves.

Even in the rare case where an individual receives a large return, it is likely that he would quickly redeem the bonds, thereby placing a further burden on the Treasury.

From time to time, the Treasury's Savings Bonds Division distributes news releases warning of the illegality of chain-letter schemes involving Savings Bonds. When a specific instance is brought to its attention, special releases are distributed to news media in the areas involved.

Individuals who buy savings bonds

for such chain-letter schemes, and who discover that participation may violate certain laws and regulations, may request a refund, using Treasury Form PD-2966. This form is available at many banks; it may also be requested from the Bureau of the Public Debt, 200 Third St., Parkersburg, W. Va. 26101.

Now it's liberation for the young men. For the first time, they can become DAR Good Citizens.

For years, the Daughters of the American Revolution have been bestowing the coveted award on the outstanding female member of the senior class at each high school participating.

The Good Citizen award—involving pin and certificate and the opportunity to go on to state and national honor—has been given on the basis of dependability, leadership, service and patriotism.

The DAR Continental Congress, meeting

last April in Washington, decreed that liberation is a two-way street, and the girls-only condition for the award had to go.

For the first time, schools that select a winner for the honor were told it could go to either a boy or girl in the senior class.

IN THIS AREA, the John Sackett DAR chapter was the first to announce young men as winners. Five of its 16 honorees, including Willard John Graham of Bishop Borgess High and Joseph Soncrant of Thurston High, are males.

The chapter gave out pins and certificates at a luncheon meeting in the Redford Township home of Mrs. Clayton Nacker.

Redford residents Bill Graham and Joe Soncrant and their mothers were present, along with two other area winners, St. Agatha's Kathleen Kelly, also of Redford, and Ann Steward of Farmington Hills, a senior at Clarenceville High School.

The other male who received an award at the luncheon was Dave Griffin of Redford High School in Detroit. Young men from Menominee and Republic also received two of the awards the John Sackett chapter presents to outstate areas.

MRS. JAMES F. ROGERS of Farmington Hills, the chapter's awards chairman, said that traditionally the selection of the winner in each school is up to the school administration and students and the DAR chapter has nothing to do with it.

"But I'm very pleased at the change that lets boys win too," she added. "I have two sons, and I feel there was discrimination for too long. It's about time for a change."

Her "it's about time" words were echoed by Joe Soncrant, who said he was really pleased and honored by the award.

Soncrant, active in Redford Township community projects as well as those at school, also has a part-time job with a Dearborn travel agency and wants to go Schoolcraft College next year, aiming for a career in hotel management or tourism.

At Thurston High, he's editor of the student newspaper, senior class president, and a member of the student council and the National Honor Society.

He also serves as Ecology Club president, and that interest carries over into community activity, because he's corresponding secretary of the Redford Township Beautification Commission. One more interest involves the township's bicentennial commission. He's second vice-chairman.

BILL GRAHAM confessed to being "a little surprised at first" when he learned he was winner of the DAR award.

"I guess I had thought of the DAR as a ladies' organization," he added. "But I'm certainly pleased and honored."

Graham has been president of his class at Bishop Borgess for four years, and he's also a leading debater, plays football and sings in the chorus for the school's spring musical.

He has a part-time job, as an X-ray attendant at Providence Hospital. A National Merit semi-finalist, he's trying to decide whether to go to the University of Michigan or Notre Dame University, and whether to go into law or engineering.

This Good Citizen has a special tradition to follow. Cecelia Wright, honored by the John Sackett DAR as Bishop Borgess' outstanding senior last year, became one of 12 finalists in the selection of a DAR Good Citizen for the state of Michigan.

THE TWO YOUNG WOMEN honored by the chapter also are student leaders in their schools.

Kathleen Kelly has been treasurer of her St. Agatha class for two years and is active in student government. She also has assisted in her church's after-school education program and was a homecoming princess last fall.

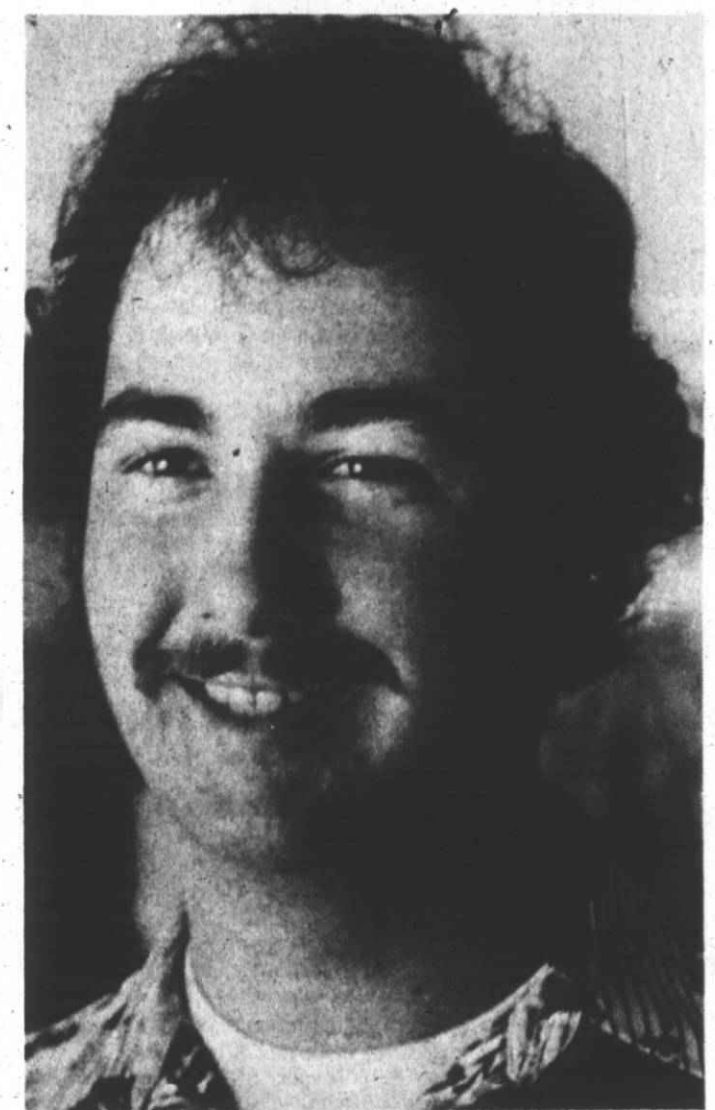
After graduation in June, she plans to train as a laboratory technician in the program offered by Mt. Carmel hospital.

At Madonna

Program's aim is better care for elderly

Improving the quality of care for the elderly is the objective of a year-long program at Madonna College, Livonia.

Fifty persons, employed in the care of the elderly or serving them as volunteers, are receiving paraprofessional training to improve their understanding and upgrade their skills in the care of the aged. The participants range in age from 18 to the mid-50s.

"Nursing home employees who have the most frequent contact with patients are generally undereducated in the fundamentals of their jobs," said Sr. Colleen Morris, R.N., director of the Madonna gerontology programs. "Yet such employees usually aides and orderlies, deliver 80 to 90 per cent of the care."

TO INCREASE the quality of care for the aged, the Madonna program provides courses in communication skills, educational gerontology, social gerontology, nursing care of the aged, nutrition for the elderly, care for the aging, and psychology of the aging.

Since the program is "competency based," all students must master certain basic skills in each course before proceeding to more advanced courses. At the end of each course they must demonstrate proficiency by producing effective solutions to real or hypothetical problems.

In the course on nutrition for the elderly, for example, students must specify and

apply those concepts of good nutrition which are particularly important to the elderly. To demonstrate this they are given information about the health and living arrangements of certain elderly persons and, within their budget, plan nutritious menus and food purchases for a week.

Although only 35 of those in the program had completed high school, all may earn 16 semester hours of college credit upon completion of the program. Twelve persons came into the program with some college education.

"PARAPROFESSIONAL training will open up career advancement possibilities for the students involved," said Sr. Colleen. "When they demonstrate on-the-job improved care of the elderly." In addition to receiving certificates, those who complete the program may apply their credit toward a degree program in gerontology.

Nearly half of the trainees work in Detroit and the others in resident facilities, hospitals, or municipal programs for the elderly in 17 surrounding communities.

Classes meet at hours convenient to the students, who relate on-the-job experiences to the theory of the classroom. Special evaluators attending with the students are three members of the Madonna College Advisory Committee on the Aging: Mrs. Alma Black of Detroit, Mrs. Loretta Conway of Farmington, and Mrs. Louise DiMartini of Livonia.

CARE sending Guatemala aid

In response to an urgent request from the Guatemalan government, telephoned from Guatemala City by William Salas, CARE director there, the international aid agency is flying medical supplies, blankets, and other emergency assistance to the hapless victims.

An initial shipment already arrived from the U.S. includes a 150,000 tetra cycline capsules, 75,000 penicillin tablets, 2500 vials of penicillin injection, and enough tetanus toxin for 2500 immunizations.

In nearby Honduras, CARE staff has purchased 5,000 blankets which have been flown to Guatemala City by the Honduran airforce.

CARE, which has ongoing child-feeding, medical, agricultural and other self-help programs in Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and other Latin American countries, was on the spot and able to swing

into immediate action. Food commodities, stockpiled by CARE for child-feeding in Guatemala and neighboring countries are available as needed to be rushed and distributed to the hungry.

The U.S. ambassador has instructed the Peace Corps in Guatemala to make available all the volunteers CARE can use to speed help to the victims. CARE staff members in nearby countries will also be rushed if necessary.

With thousands dead, several thousands injured and at least 100,000 homeless in Guatemala City alone, CARE's executive director, Frank L. Goffio, today issued an urgent appeal for funds to continue CARE emergency aid to the quake victims and for crucial rehabilitation and reconstruction as soon as possible.

Hearing centers on child care

Directors of area nursery schools may find it a little easier to reach county child care workers as a result of a series of hearings now being held by the Child Care Coordinating Council of Detroit-Wayne County (4C).

In Livonia last week, the agency heard professionals in the field of child care services and education underline the necessity of paying attention to the pre-school child.

"It is essential that our policy board, while setting up its priorities for the coming year, hears what each community identifies as its child care programs, problems and concerns," said the hearing chairman.

She is Sharon Elliott, chairperson of 4C and director of the Wayne State University School of Education's child care center at Jeffries Housing Project.

One of the hearing speakers, Mary Hoffman of Farmington, director of the Rose-dale Child Care Center in northwest Detroit, complained of difficulty reaching a county child care worker when she needed one.

"THIS MAY SEEM like something small," reported Mrs. Elliott after the meeting, "but because we have heard this complaint at our other hearings, we plan to set up a process so that these people can get together more easily."

She observed that John Andrew, director of youth services in Westland, had raised an interesting point when he discussed his program for youngsters from seven to 17.

"He mentioned that he is sometimes involved with troubled youths, and said that for all he knew their problems began long before the age of seven," said Mrs. Elliott. "He felt we must pay attention to them even before the age of seven, discover their family structure and involve support services."

DONALD FRIEDRICHS, director of community education and services for the Livonia School District, indicated there is "a growing commitment on the part of public schools to the early childhood years."

Attending the meeting also was one of the persons in Livonia who is concerned directly with this age group, Dolly Cox, director of the Parent Readiness Education Project (PREP), a program for pre-schoolers. She expressed regret that more local educators and child workers in the child care field had not been on hand to inform the county of their concerns.

Friedrichs noted that the state board of education recently adopted for the first time a goal relating specifically to the pre-school child. This means the state intends to determine what resources are needed to provide programs to enrich pre-school experiences of children in need of enrichment.

"The next step is deciding what programs are needed, and what their quality should be," he stated. "Decisions will have to be made on such matters as the training needed for people working with children that age."

Robert McFarling, chairman of the newly-founded Livonia Council on Early

Childhood Services, noted that his group seemed to be off to a good start. It has a library of 200 volumes on child-related subjects housed in Johnson Elementary School, as well as 200 persons on the mailing list for its newsletter.

He also suggested that attention be paid to the approaching Week of the Young Child to take place April 3-10.

Both he and Mrs. Della Tisnow of Westland, a child care worker for the Wayne County Department of Social Services, stressed the importance of latch key programs to supervise young children whose mothers work after school hours.

"These young children should not be left alone," said Mrs. Tisnow.

During the hearing, Mrs. Elliott referred to Livonia Council on Early Childhood Services as "fantastic."

She added, "Last year Livonians said they needed an organization like this and 4C helped them start."

Pat Hauser of 4C is the consultant for the Livonia organization.

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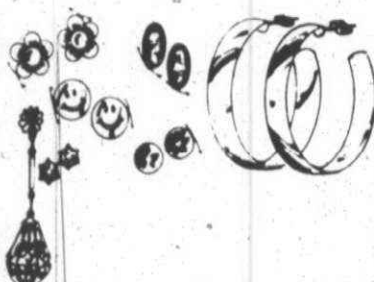


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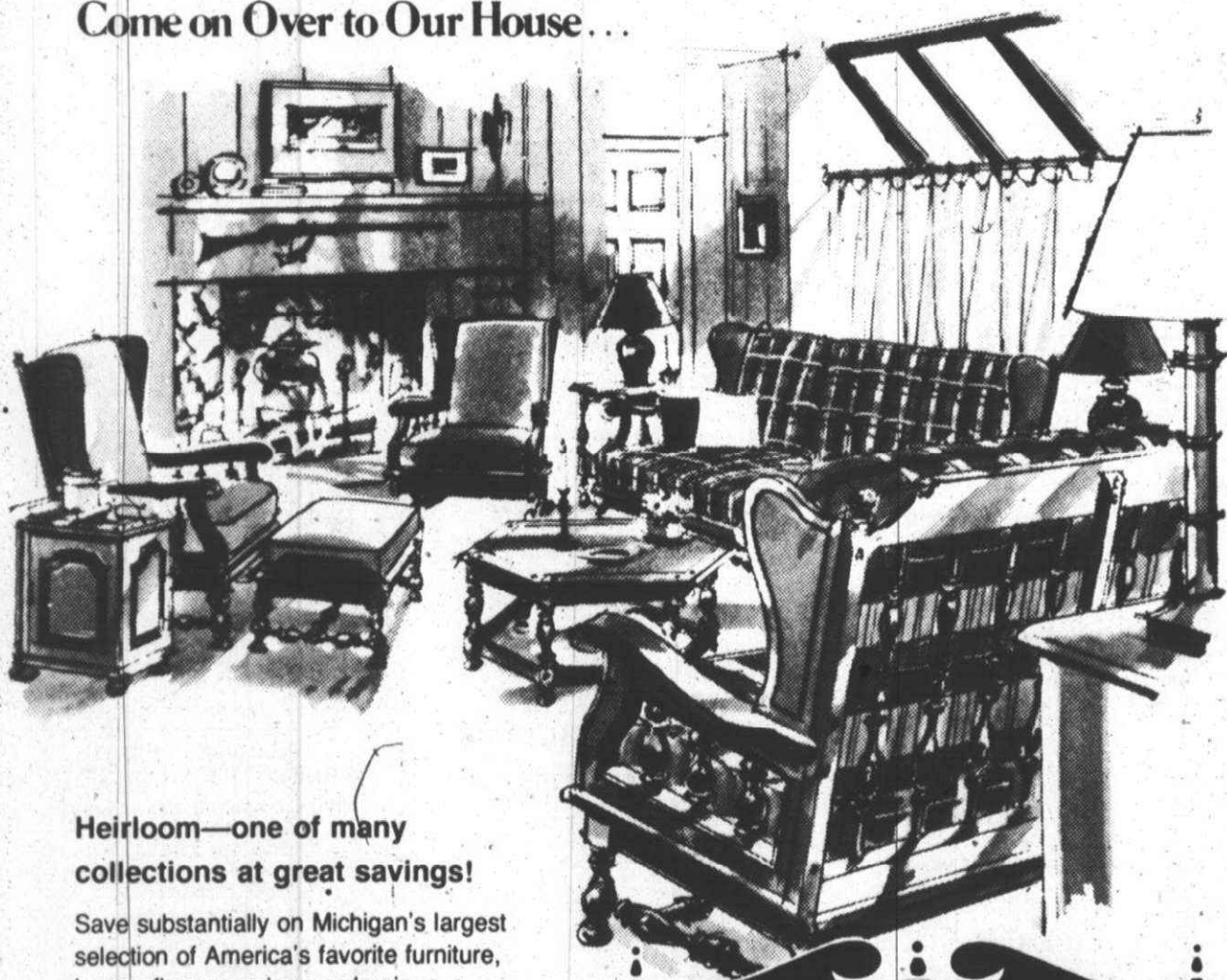
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Church of Savior sets family weekend

Ellie Down is a loyal member of Ward United Presbyterian Church, Livonia. So when its pastor, Dr. Bartlett Hess, asked her a year ago to write a musical for the bicentennial, she naturally got right to work.

The result of a year of effort will be ready for viewing and hearing Sunday, Feb. 22, at 7 p.m. in the church, 17000 Farmington Road. Called "The Ring of Freedom!" it is full of color and music, tied together with slides and a narration by Gregg Vorbeck.

Members of the audience will meet in person George Washington and Ben Franklin, both played by Carl Farquhar. Betsy Ross (Daisy Redmond) will be on hand with her flag, as will John Adams (Morand Zimmer) and Patrick Henry (Larry Schrock).

These four singers will be aided by five other soloists, George Galbreath, Flossie Behler, Howard Phelps, Ken Cornwall and Sherry Scott. Organist is Carol Halmekangas, pianist is Sharon Smith. Featured as the spirit of '76 will be Mark Williams,

a Bentley High School student, on the drums and Lyle Kellman of Stevenson on the piccolo. The flag will be carried by Charles Hardy.

Hardy was selected by Mrs. Downs because of his resemblance to the flag carrier in the famous picture, the Spirit of '76. "I saw him in a crowd," reported Mrs. Downs. "I went right over and asked him, 'Would you like to do something stupendous?'"

DOING SOMETHING as stupendous as mounting a full theatrical production on American history sounds pretty complicated for a woman who never paid attention in history class.

"I'm a history buff now," confessed Mrs. Down. "Before I started writing the script and the songs, I began reading about those marvelous patriots. Before I knew it, I was writing two songs at once. I turn on my tape recorder while driving to work and sing onto the tape. Otherwise I forget the songs."

"It is an inspiration reading about all those people. Basically they were doing the same kinds of things people are doing

today, trying to solve problems."

One of the most enjoyable aspects of the project for Mrs. Down is finding people who become as interested in it as she is.

"The Dearborn librarians all became enthusiastic," she said. "The photographer and other craftsmen who pooled their talents on the show also became excited."

TWO OF THESE craftsmen are sculptors and created the star of the evening, the Liberty Bell.

"It's uncanny," said Mrs. Down, "but Jim McBain and Lloyd Dutcheson, who made the bell, look very much like the original makers of the Liberty Bell, John Pass and Charles Stow. And the new bell had an experience similar to one had by the old."

"When the British marched into Philadelphia, all the bells were carried out in wagons. Our bell was carried in the back of a truck to the church."

A fan of President Ford, Mrs. Down wrote him into a segment involving the presidents. "A painting of him is being done especially for the musical," she announced. "I sent him a copy of the script

and a tape of the musical along with an invitation to the performance."

"I am sure it would be impossible for him to come," she said, adding with a laugh, "but I told the choir members to be sure I have their names and phone numbers, just in case they send a jet for us from Washington."

MRS. DOWN pulls a Woody Allen for this show, writing the script and directing the rehearsals. Although she doesn't perform, she goes the comedian one better by not only composing the songs, but directing the choir which will sing them.

"I've been writing songs for several years," noted Mrs. Down who is director of the children's choir at Ward as well as an executive secretary at Ford Motor Co. This is not her first musical, but it is the one she thinks is her best. She previously wrote "Listen to the Bells," a Christmas musical.

A resident of Livonia for 14 years and a grandmother, Mrs. Down revealed that her ambition in life is to do just what she's doing.

"My life is so full," she said.

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A. When the cost of natural gas supplies rises above or falls below the fuel cost that's included in the gas rate approved by the State regulatory agency, the increase or decrease shows up on your gas bill as a Fuel Cost Adjustment. Q. Why is the Fuel Cost Adjustment needed?

A. The cost of gas — which includes the natural gas purchased from our pipeline suppliers and the cost of petroleum liquids used to manufacture synthetic natural gas — has increased to a cost level over 2½ times the cost level of three years ago. The increase was over 36% during this past year, alone. There is simply no way the Company could absorb all of this increased cost. The Fuel Cost Adjustment permits us to recover this added expense — without it, we couldn't stay in business.

Q. Why does it vary from month to month?

A. The cost per unit of gas increases or decreases from that of the previous month when the supply of synthetic natural gas manufactured by the Company is interrupted or there is a change in the cost or availability of raw petroleum products used to manufacture it. Significant price changes in pipeline supplies also affect the Fuel Cost Adjustment. We don't make a penny profit from the Fuel Cost Adjustment. It reflects monthly fuel cost changes and it works both ways — when fuel costs increase, the charge increases; when fuel costs go down, the charge goes down.

Q. How can I calculate the amount of Fuel Cost Adjustment included in my bill?

A. You can calculate it by multiplying the gas Fuel Cost Adjustment factor on your bill (see sample bill) times the number of units of gas you used (see sample bill). The result will be the actual amount of the Fuel Cost Adjustment for that month.

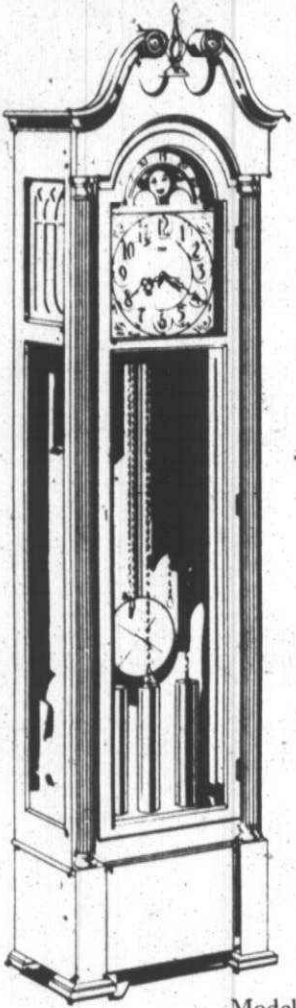

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Dee Dee knows how Put on a happy face

Finding one's identity isn't easy, especially when you're a clown. First you've got to settle on a name, and then you've got to find a face.

David Duey of Northville, now known as Dee Dee the Clown, used to let the kids name him. They called him everything from "Rudolph" at Christmas to "Mr. Clown" and "Dinky."

His new name, which he plans to keep, was chosen for him by Bill Kruse, manager at Northville Charley's where Dee Dee performs Mondays at Family Night. Dee Dee stands for his initials.

The clown face he wears is chalk white with a big red nose and an incredible red and green mouth. His rimmed eyeglasses are topped with fringed eyelashes.

"THIS IS the first face I've ever been happy with," he said. "I don't want to change faces ever again."

It takes Duey two hours to put on his

make-up, and he usually does this at the restaurant, for understandable reasons. If he does it beforehand, "I get some of the strangest looks," he said.

Once, driving to the restaurant already made up, he was stopped by a police car. The officer demanded, "What are you doing?" The question turned into a friendly chat, and suddenly Duey realized, "It was five after five and I was going to be late for work."

The helpful officers "drove a flashing light through Northville" to escort Dee Dee to work.

Being a clown isn't only fun. It's hard work and expensive too. Duey estimates it costs him \$8 an hour, including his costume and the balloons, at four cents each, he blows up for the children.

Actually, Duey is a cook at Northville Charley's. When he isn't clowning on Mondays, he works in the kitchen making bread and pizzas.

HE GAINED experience as a clown at

another restaurant where he used to work. A clown there showed him how, and also taught him to make animal balloons.

Dee Dee, all six-feet, five-inches of him, is dressed in a green and yellow suit, of clown-patterned fabric. His hat is a derby with a flower wiggling on a wire. His shoes are green sneakers with bows.

Talking about the high cost of clowning, he said clown suits are not cheap. He pointed to his frizzled hair. "I just bought this wig today. It cost me \$30."

Then Duey extended a sneakered shoe. "I've got to get some clown shoes. You mail away to New York for them."

When Northville Charley's opened last fall, Monday Night Football on a giant screen was an attraction. After football, another feature was needed, and Duey offered his services as a clown.

When families arrive, they are asked, "Are you here for Dee Dee the Clown?" and ushered into the back room if they are interested. There's a kiddie menu with Wing Ding (chicken wings), burgers, hot dogs and a cone sundae.

For the grown-ups, the regular menu offers ribs, Chef Larry's pizza and a variety of fish and seafood, in this informal Chuck Muer restaurant.

Dee Dee the Clown blows up balloons for the children, and their parents, too. Some boys and girls ask for exotic animals, he said, such as an Alaskan Schnauzer or a Pregnant Cow.

"I get letters from kids that can't write, or kids talk to you that can't talk," Duey said.

One child approached the table during the interview to ask Dee Dee, "Were your Mom and Dad clowns?" He said yes.

Another day, a little girl leaned over to give him a kiss. "She got a whole faceful of white make-up," he recalled.

A native of Northville, 20-year-old Duey lives at home with his parents. He performs for charities without charge.

"I do the freebies, and charge my friends. I'm getting experience," he said.

Giving some tips on balloon artistry, he said, "The only trick is not to be afraid of them, that they're going to pop. Don't blow them up all the way and do them (knot them) from one end."

To get the balloon started, "Blow from your lungs, down from the diaphragm. There's no secret. You've got to get used to it. Try blowing up 250 of these a night."

Montagano singled out both Clare and Foster for their work against the Falcons. "Clare's a horse on the boards. Most of his points came on rebounds or breaks to the basket," the coach said.

"Foster had one heck of an assist game in addition to his 17 points," Montagano added.

The Churchill mentor also praised aspects of the Falcons' play in spite of their defeat. "They hustle and shoot well from the outside. I'm impressed with their shooting."

The Chargers next swing into action tomorrow (Friday) hosting Walled Lake Western in an 8 p.m. start.
