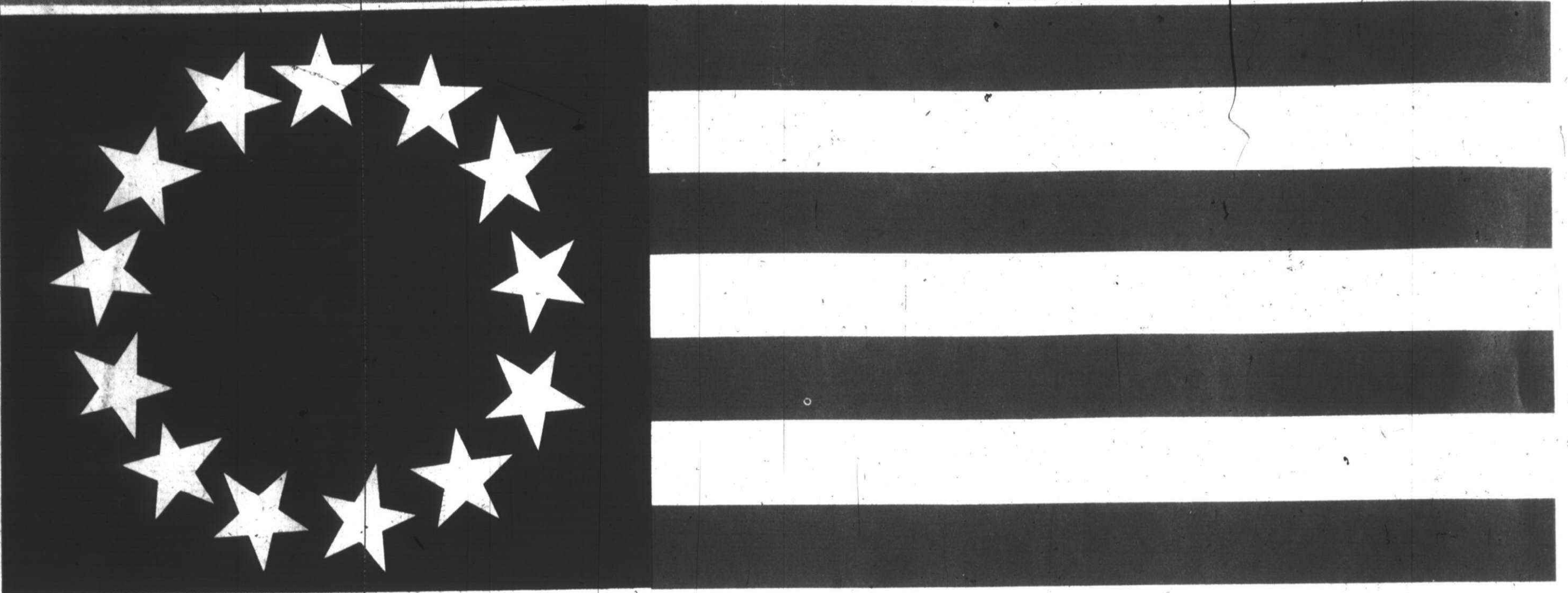
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IN CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776.

## The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America.

When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation. We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object, evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security. Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world. He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good. He has forbidden his Governors to pass laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them. He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only. He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures. He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people. He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; whereby the Legislative powers, incapable of Annihilation, have returned to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the meantime exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within. He has endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing the Laws for Naturalization of Foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migrations hither, and raising the conditions of new Appropriations of Lands. He has obstructed the Administration of Justice, by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary powers. He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone, for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment of their salaries. He has erected a multitude of New Offices, and sent hither swarms of Officers to harass our people, and eat out their substance. He has kept among us in times of peace, Standing Armies without the Consent of our legislatures. He has affected to render the Military independent of and superior to the Civil power. He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his Assent to their

Acts of pretended Legislation: For quartering large bodies of armed troops among us: For protecting them, by a mock trial, from punishment for any Murders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States: For cutting off our Trade with all parts of the world: For imposing Taxes on us without our Consent: For depriving us in many cases, of the benefits of Trial by Jury: For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for pretended offences: For abolishing the free System of English Laws in a neighbouring Province, establishing therein an Arbitrary government, and enlarging its Boundaries so as to render it at once an example and fit instrument for introducing the same absolute rule into these Colonies: For taking away our Charters, abolishing our most valuable Laws, and altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments: For suspending our own Legislatures and declaring themselves invested with power to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever. He has abdicated Government here, by declaring us out of His Protection, and waging War against us. He is at this time transporting large Armies of foreign Mercenaries to complete the works of death, desolation and tyranny, already begun with circumstances of Cruelty & perfidy scarcely paralleled in the most barbarous ages, and totally unworthy the Head of a civilized nation. He has constrained our fellow Citizens taken Captive on the high Seas to bear Arms against their Country, to become the executioners of their Friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands. He has excited domestic insurrections amongst us, and has endeavoured to bring on the inhabitants of our frontiers, the merciless Indian Savages, whose known rule of warfare, is an undistinguished destruction of all ages, sexes and conditions. In every stage of these Oppressions We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms. Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A Prince, whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people. Nor have We been wanting in attention to our British brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice, and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

WE, THEREFORE, the Representatives of the UNITED STATES of AMERICA, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be, FREE AND INDEPENDENT STATES; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which INDEPENDENT STATES may of right do. AND for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor.

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# Hunt resigns as director; museum renews search

Lured by an attractive offer to go 'back home' to Topeka, Kan., Mark Hunt who has served as director of the Plymouth Historical Museum for the past five months, has submitted his resignation.

His action, which takes effect July 9, came as a complete surprise to the Plymouth Historical Commission and the museum board, which already has started the hunt for a replacement.

In his new position, Hunt will be curator of exhibits for the state of Kansas and will be located in the state historical museum in the city he has called 'home.'

The offer was just too good, he said in explaining his resignation, "and it gives me the chance to be back with the home folks."

ADMITTEDLY a bit home sick, he added. "When a fellow spends most of his life in one place and then leaves, he still can't fully cut the old ties."

It is ironic that his parents visited him just a few weeks ago, but he claims their presence in Plymouth did not bring about his decision to go back home. He said the

offer came as a complete surprise even though he had sought the position before coming to Plymouth.

"It is an opportunity I just can't afford to miss," he emphasized after explaining that he enjoyed his work of getting the museum opened.

Coming here direct from a training school, he succeeded Phil Macrowski at a time when the officials were clamoring for the museum to be opened.

On the morning he accepted the post, he informed Margaret Dunning, donor of the building, that his top priority was to get the building opened so the people could see what a grand place it is. He made good his word. The museum was opened within a month or so.

THE MUSEUM BOARD accepted Hunt's resignation with regret and let it be known that it came as a complete surprise. Only a few weeks ago he was married and it was felt that he would be a resident of Plymouth for a long time.

To speed up the choice of a new director, the museum board appointed Betty Zimmerman, Richard Gornick and Harold Guenther as a three-member committee to

screen all applicants and make a choice as soon as possible.

Solon Weeks, director of the Detroit Historical Museum when it is open, will be asked to serve in an advisory capacity.

Employment of a director has been a problem with museum officials since the building was completed. It took months be-

fore Macrowski was appointed as the first to hold the job. Prior to his appointment several others showed interest, but at the last minute turned elsewhere.

When Hunt was appointed it was with the feeling that the long hunt had ended. Now he is leaving and the hunt is starting all over again.

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# Open school without cuts, Lawton urges

Pupils in the Plymouth Community School District may not have to cope with reduced programs and teaching levels at the start of the school year next fall, if school board Trustee George Lawton has his way.

To avoid the havoc that approval of a proposed millage election in mid-September would produce, Lawton Monday proposed no cuts in programs or staff until after election day in September.

Then, he says, if voters turn down another millage request, school board members will have to make the cuts needed to trim an estimated \$2.2 million off the school district's budget.

LAWTON MONDAY offered his recommendation at the board's first public work-

shop on budget cuts, necessitated by defeat of an additional 4.75-mill (\$4.75 per \$1,000 state equalized value) request in May. Board members are expected to take official action on the budget cuts at their July 6 meeting.

But, according to Lawton, cutting programs and re-implementing them if the proposed millage issue in September is approved would create the same havoc and disruption of classes as maintaining present programs and cutting them if the millage issue is turned down.

The board cannot schedule another millage election until September because of state election laws banning a school election within 30 days of another election (Aug. 3 primary).

"It would seem that either route you take, you're going to disrupt programs," Lawton said. "Frankly, with the attitude of the community, I happen to be optimistic about the millage's approval."

"I would like the board to keep all programs through Sept. 13, if that's the millage date, and make the changes after that time if necessary."

Lawton estimates the cost of maintaining the district's present programs for five days after the start of the 1976-77 school year at \$50,000 to \$70,000. Pink-slipped teachers would be encouraged to remain with the district on a temporary basis until election day, according to his plan.

ALTHOUGH Lawton's suggestion brought a round of applause from the ap-

proximate 75 residents who attended Monday's workshop, school officials were more leery of the plan.

"I think it's naive for us to assume the pink-slipped teachers would twiddle their thumbs until the election, while, some school districts are hiring teachers," said board vice-president Marcia Borowski. "I don't think we can expect our teachers to wait."

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, noted the school board's plan to hire additional teachers to maintain programs if the millage issue had passed in June. Board Trustee E.J. McClendon feared Lawton's plan could create lawsuits with the Plymouth Education Association over breaking of teacher contracts.

"The suggestion Lawton makes has a great deal of appeal," McClendon admitted. "I'd like to do it, but I think it has too many risks. I'd like to take a long, hard look at this and get a legal opinion."

Lawton's plan could damage the school board's credibility, warned board president Marda Benson, referring to the board's threat of cuts if the June millage issue failed.

"I'm not a bit concerned about this board's credibility," Lawton responded. "I feel the people are competent to discern that this board is attempting to provide the best possible education for young people."

"I have not suggested to hire new people but only to protect our present staff. I'm

just looking at the overall picture. We're not talking about a very large amount of money."

Responded Trustee Joe Gray, "I'm optimistic too that the millage will fly, but teachers have to know where they're going. We can't just dump them somewhere on Sept. 14. I hate to tie these people up, if they have a chance of employment in another district."

Residents at Monday's meeting voiced support of Lawton's plan.

"I think George has the only solution," one resident said. "It's very positive and has a lot of psychological pluses. With this, I think you'd have the best opportunity to pass your millage in the fall. I think the risks are measured and can be reduced."

## Bicentennial-in-Park ends tonight

A concert by an all-girls Danish band, music by the Plymouth Community Band, and a sing-along led by the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) are the features of the final program in the Bicentennial-in-the-Park series.

The program will begin at 8 p.m. Thursday, July 1, in Kellogg Park. In event of rain, the concerts and the sing-along will be held in the auditorium of Plymouth Salem High on Joy just west of Canton Center Road.

EIGHTY GIRLS from Copenhagen, Denmark, will be giving their first American concert as they begin a U.S. tour with the Plymouth park performance.

Three performing units—stage band, concert band, and fife and drum corps—are contained in the touring group. The girls, age 12-21, will be staying in Plymouth from June 29 through July 5. They also will march in the Plymouth Fourth of July Parade Sunday.

The Plymouth Community Band, directed by James Griffith, will share the spotlight on stage, with the Danish girls during the evening concert. This will be the second in the Community Band's series of 1976 summer concerts. The band will continue performing in Kellogg Park every Thursday evening through July 29.

WHEN THE BANDS break for intermission, the park audience will be able to participate in a bit of bicentennial nostalgia.

Fred Bradley and members of the Plymouth-Northville AARP will lead the audience in an old-fashioned sing-along program, "Our Heritage of Song," containing 27 patriotic and popular favorites dating from 1770 to 1950.

The AARP has printed copies of "Our Heritage of Song," which will be distributed to the audience to refer to as they sing along and to keep as bicentennial souvenirs.

Bradley carefully researched the songs included in the sheet. Besides the traditional favorites, it contains "The Liberty Song"—the first patriotic American song, written in 1768—and the original words to the melody which Francis Scott Key used as the music for "The Star Spangled Banner."

Other selections will include the original version of "America," "Yankee Doodle

Do," "Beautiful Dreamer," "Dixie," "Battle Hymn of the Republic," "America the Beautiful," "My Wild Irish Rose," "I'm a Yankee Doodle Dandy," "Let Me Call You Sweetheart," and "Michigan, My Michigan."

Members of the AARP will be present to help start the park singing, but the entire audience will be encouraged to join in the nostalgic bicentennial spirit. Piano accom-

panist for the sing-along will be Mrs. Fanny Bear.

The Plymouth, Northville, Canton, Novi League of Women Voters will be set up in the park from 8-9 p.m. for its final evening of bicentennial voter registration.

The Bicentennial-in-the-Park series is being sponsored by the City of Plymouth with arrangements handled by the Community Bicentennial Commission.

## Lantern exchange is highlight

The detailed plans have been completed for the passing of the lantern along the Bicentennial Mile preceding Sunday's July Fourth Parade.

Persons who have signed up to pass the lantern—a replica of the one hung in Christ's Church to signal the British were coming by land—will begin assembling at 11:20 a.m.

Markers will be placed along the east side of Main Street from Hartsough to the Plymouth Rock at city hall. The markers will designate the group of years from 1776 to 1976.

At 11:40 a.m. horsemen will ride from Hartsough to city hall which will be a signal for participants to move to the center of Main Street. At 11:50 a.m. a rider dressed in Paul Revere's costume will pick up the lantern from city hall and deliver it to the first person in line at Hartsough.

From noon to 12:30 p.m. the lantern will pass through 1,776 hands, followed by a drummer boy, to the Plymouth Rock. Participants may follow the lantern back up Main Street to city hall.

THE PARADE will start after presenta-

tion of the lantern at the Plymouth Rock. The parade procession will stop at the Rock for a brief ceremony honoring British Consul J.J. Hyslop.

Persons participating in the lantern passing will be given a Bicentennial Mile Button—a special, limited commemorative button made for the occasion. Participants may pick up their button from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday or from 8-10 a.m. Sunday at 186 N. Main, at the corner of Union next to Krogers.

Residents who haven't signed up for the Bicentennial Mile event yet, but wish to, may do so from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday or 8-10 a.m. Sunday at 186 N. Main.

The replica of Paul Revere's lantern was donated by the Early American Shop for the Bicentennial Mile. After July Fourth, the Plymouth Jaycees will present the lantern to the Plymouth Historical Museum.

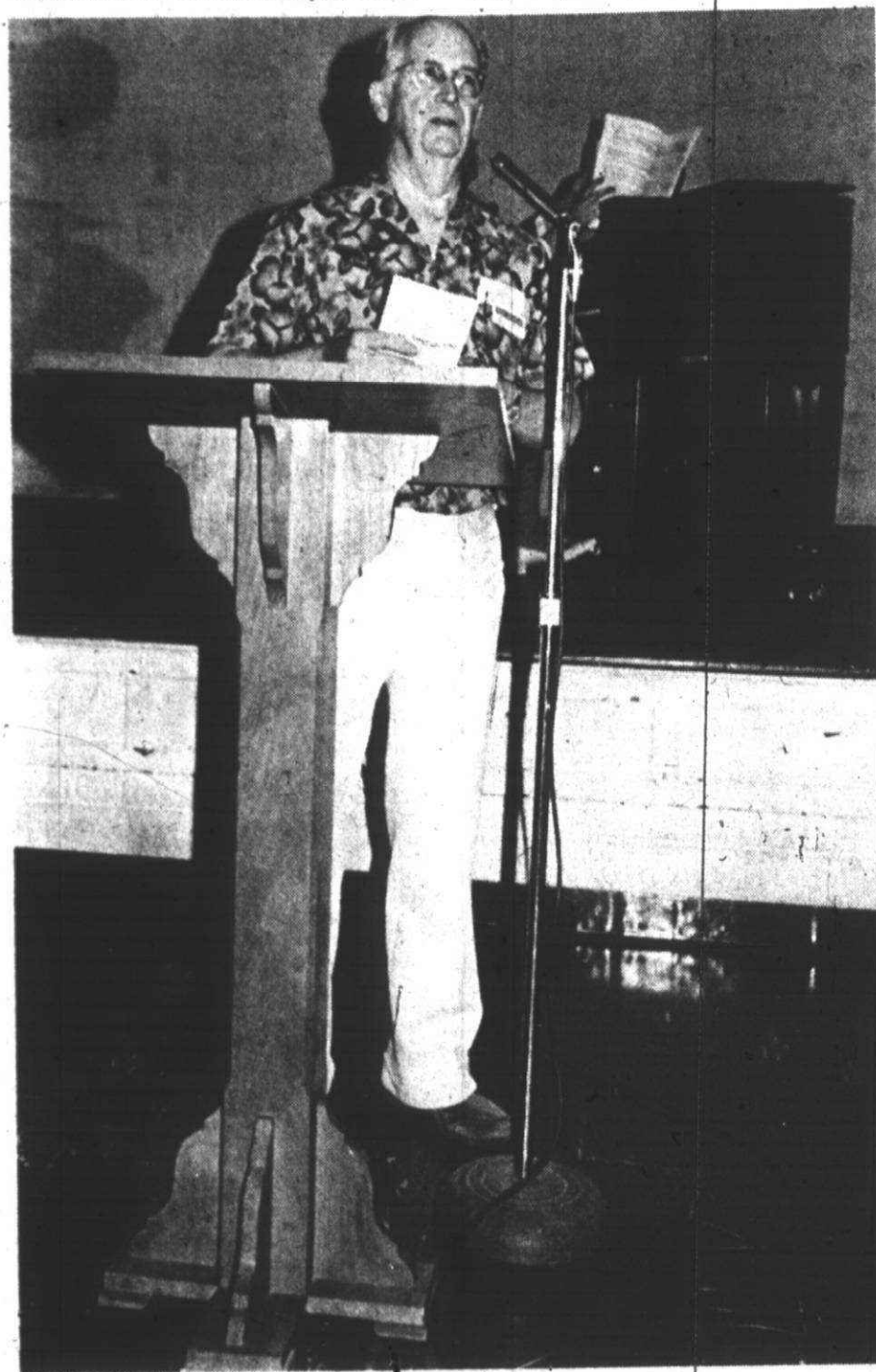
THE MILE will begin at the corner of Hartsough and Main with the year 1776.

S. Main; 1815-1817 at Burroughs and Main; 1836-1846 at Goodyear Tires; 1852-1864 at Farmer Jacks; 1875-1876, Anderson Music Store; 1883-1886, J.L. Hudson Realty; 1887-1889, Wing Street; 1898-1908, the new First National Bank building; 1922-1926, the Observer & Eccentric, 461 Main, and Mayflower Meetinghouse; 1934-1938, Ann Arbor Trail; 1953-1957, Penniman Avenue; 1962-1964, Lents parking lot; 1967-1969, Plymouth Insurance at 249 S. Main; 1972-1975, the library; and 1976 at the Plymouth Rock.

Those participating in the lantern passing have been asked to make a donation of \$1 each to help the Jaycees pay for the expenses of putting on the July Fourth Parade and the fireworks that evening.

The lantern was placed in the steeple by Robert Newman, then 23, who was sexton for Christ's Church and brother of the church's organist. The information that the British were coming by land was actually conveyed by Revere to Newman who hung the lantern as a signal to William Dawes and others. Revere was probably enroute when the signal was given. He was captured at Lexington by the British, and then set free to return to Boston, with Dawes making the ride to Concord.

## Parade promises to be big

The bicentennial parade on July Fourth will be one of the longest, and more spectacular parades put on by the Plymouth Jaycees.

Some 85 units will be in the parade Sunday, as compared to about 60 units which appeared in last year's parade. Among the special guests riding in convertibles will be G. Mennen Williams, former governor of Michigan and ambassador to the Philippines.

The parade will begin at 12:30 p.m. Sunday at Theodore and Main Street and proceed south on Main. The parade will be temporarily halted in front of city hall for a brief ceremony in front of the Plymouth Rock. Greetings will be exchanged between Mayor Joe Bida and the Hon. J.J. Hyslop, British Consul General who is retiring from his position this year.

After the ceremony at the Rock, the parade will continue down Main Street to Hartsough where it will proceed to East Middle School to disband.

THERE WILL be fireworks the evening of July 4 at the Massey Ball Diamonds on Plymouth Road just across the street from Burroughs Corporation, Plymouth Township.

To view the fireworks, residents should drive to the parking lot at Burroughs on the north side of Plymouth Road immediately west of the Burroughs plant. Both the parade and fireworks are sponsored by the Plymouth Jaycees.

The Bicentennial Mile lantern passing will precede the beginning of the parade with activities occurring from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Main from Hartsough to city hall.

After the parade is ended, hungry residents may choose beef or chicken. The Plymouth Knights of Columbus is having an ox roast starting at 1 p.m. and the Plymouth VFW Mayflower Post will have a chicken barbecue beginning at noon. The ox roast will be at Fair and Ann Arbor Trail and the chicken barbecue on Mill just north of Ann Arbor Road.

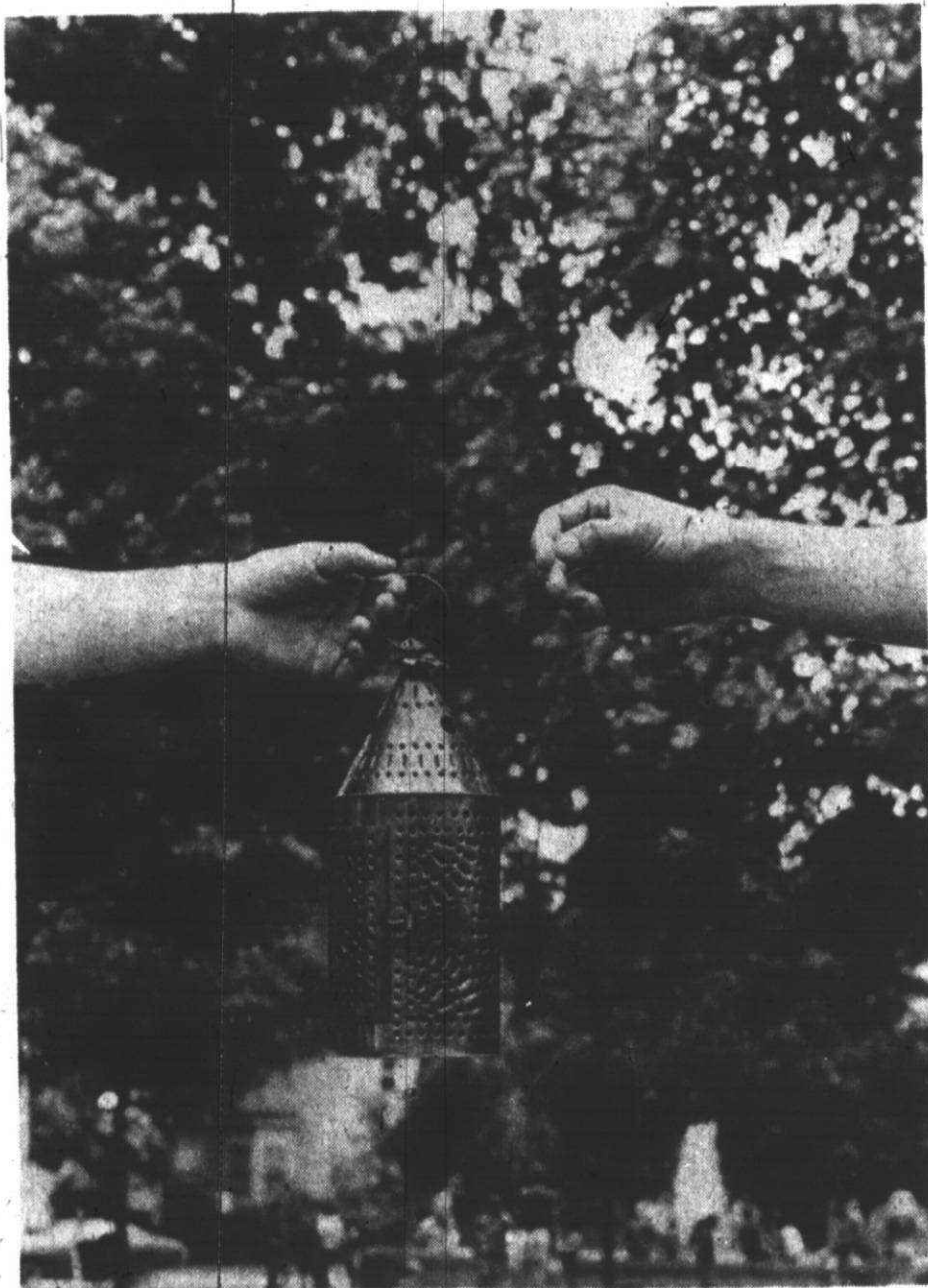
LEADING THE PARADE will be the VFW Color Guard followed by Hyslop, the parade marshal, and Mayor Bida.

Other dignitaries in the parade will include Justice Blaire Moody, U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch, State Sen. Carl Pursell, State Reps. Roy Smith and Thomas Brown, Judge Dunbar Davis, Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren, and Wayne County Sheriff William Lucas.

Among the bands and marching units will be the Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps, Clan McRae Pipe Band, Milford High School Redskin Marching Band, the Troubadors of Taylor, Canton Chieftettes, and the Danish girls band.

Floats will be entered by the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce, which will have two floats, The Green Thumb, Rotary Club of Plymouth, and kiddie floats. Also represented will be City of Plymouth and Plymouth Township fire departments, the Community Bicentennial Commission, the English taxi of the Mayflower Hotel, a number of antique cars, and the usual array of bicycles.

Plymouth Police Chief Tim Ford reminds residents to leave about 10-15 minutes early for church Sunday as Main Street will be closed about 10:45 a.m. for the lantern passing and parade.

# Republic subdivision tabled, Myers charges false advertising

Republic Development Co. ran into a roadblock last week when the township board refused to grant tentative approval of a preliminary plat for Windemere Subdivision, to be located at the southeast corner of Warren and Canton Center roads.

Voting 6-1, the board tabled the matter after Trustee Robert Myers charged that the developers were under investigation by the state attorney general's office.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein cast the lone dissenting vote.

The land, part of a planned unit development, was originally supposed to be developed as a commercial and multiple housing site.

Earlier at the developer's request, the township board approved a change in the contract, allowing Republic to build 182 single-family homes and 16 duplex lots on the 42-acre site.

Prior to the contract alteration, 40 acres were zoned for regional shopping and 22 for multiple housing.

AT THE TIME the board approved the change in proposed land use, residents and businessmen on Canton Center protested vehemently.

Proponents of the change in the PUD contract from commercial and multiple to single-family residential had argued that the change to single-family would help lock in residential use of Canton Center between Ford and Warren, as proposed in the master land use plan.

That section of the master plan has been challenged time and again by property owners and businessmen on Canton Center who say the land between Ford and Warren fronting on Canton Center should remain commercial.

While Myers charged Republic with inaccurate advertising, other members of the board found problems with the developer.

Trustee Jim Poole said Republic had a bad record on installing sidewalks and that

the duplex lots weren't in the best interest of the township.

Greenstein, who apparently favored approval of the preliminary plat, said, "I'm as violently anti-duplex as anyone alive, but it's part of the negotiated contract and it's better than commercial and multiple here."

"It's a PUD contract and they can do with it what they like. We're gaining 22 acres of non multiple."

MEYERS THEN asked Republic representative Howard Binko: "Does your company usually do what it says?"

"In Olde Plymouth you have a sign out that says your houses are 1,200 square feet and larger. Yet you have houses in that subdivision that are 950 square feet and sell for \$32,000."

"It's the old bait and switch routine in reverse. I think it constitutes fraud and I've asked the attorney general to investigate you."

"They are presently reviewing this matter and I have asked that they keep us informed."

Trustee Brian Schwall said he thought the matter should be tabled until the investigation is completed.

Greenstein responded that Myers was attempting to resurrect a dead issue.

"He came to the board a year ago with someone who bought a house and found out they were building a smaller house next door to him. The sign out front said all homes were at least \$40,000. We talked to him and he talked to Republic and the matter was settled to his satisfaction. I thought the issue was closed."

"I suggest this to you. Mr. Myers has received a form letter from the attorney general and it doesn't mean anything is under investigation. It just a procedural thing."

"WE HAVE an opportunity to rid ourselves of 240 multiples and some commercial land that won't go, plus adding homes that will make Carriage Hills and Sunflower an attractive neighbor."

"We shouldn't succumb to the baloney of Mr. Myers and his friends on Canton Center. I want to tell you the stakes are high—we are out of kindergarten now."

"It's just a cheap political maneuver and I ask the board not to be railroaded by this nonsense."

Myers countered that he was not playing kindergarten games, but doing his job. "We have an obligation to protect the residents," he said.

Binko said his company had received an inquiry from the attorney general's office recently and the matter was in the hands of Republic's attorneys.

## Board of education will pick officers

The Plymouth Board of Education will elect its officers for the coming year when it holds the annual organizational meeting, beginning 7:30 p.m. July 1 in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High.

One of the first items of business will be to swear in newly-elected trustees Richard Arlen and Flossie Tonda. The board then will elect a chairman, vice chairman, secretary and treasurer.

Officers this year have been: Marda Benson, chairman; Marcia Borowski, vice chairman; George Lawton, secretary; and Tom Yack, treasurer.

There has not been any declaration from any trustee on seeking the chairmanship. The first choices normally would be Ms. Borowski, as often the vice chairman is moved up, or Yack.

But some board observers report Ms. Borowski doesn't have the four votes needed to obtain the chairmanship. If she doesn't

wish to seek the position, or cannot garner a majority vote of the new board, Yack is considered as the second choice. Yack, however, has indicated he isn't interested in being named chairman.

Other possible choices are Lawton and E.J. McClendon, who have served as board chairman in the past, or trustee Joe Gray who was elected the same year as Yack.

Arlen and Mrs. Tonda might be considered as compromise choices, although freshmen trustees traditionally haven't been asked to assume the responsibilities as chairman.

At the organizational meeting, the board also will consider making committee assignments for trustees and vote on the school attorney, auditor and other contractual professional services for the coming school year.

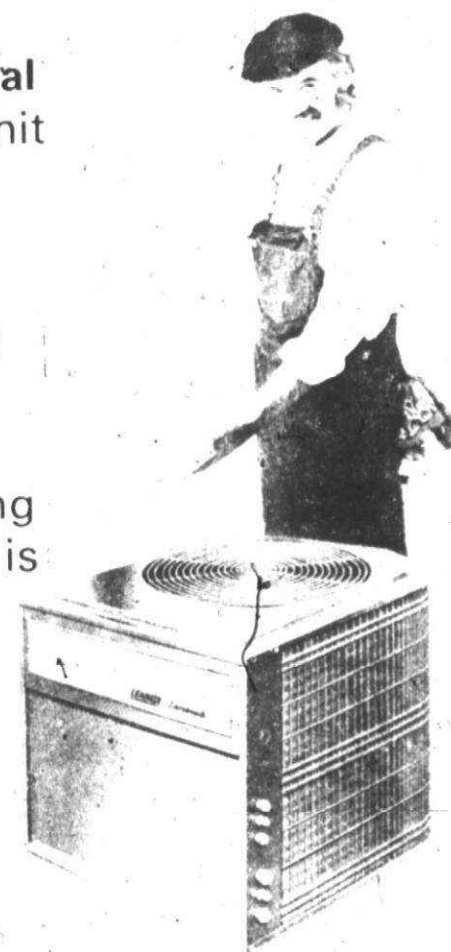

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# Suburbanites and city dwellers:

Both are happy  
where they live

This article is the second of a two-part series on the city and the suburbs. Part One revealed that the pattern of migration is now from older communities to newer ones, rather than from the city to suburbia.

Part Two examines the differences between the city dweller and the suburbanite.

Mr. and Mrs. John Smyth are spending a quiet evening at their two-story brick home somewhere in the City of Detroit. The Smyths have their windows and doors locked. It is the sort of automatic precaution they have grown used to.

"We never see too much of Ralph and Lorraine since they moved out to the sub-

urbs," Mrs. Smyth remarks wistfully. "Yeah, I know," Mr. Smyth answers. "They keep on saying that they'll stop by next time they come in to the city, but they never seem to make it out this way."

Maybe Ralph and Lorraine never liked the Smyths to begin with. But more likely the reason they never drop by anymore is because they only have one thing left in common: They're both satisfied with where they live—the Smyths in their city home and Ralph and Lorraine in their suburban home.

A 1975 University of Michigan study on the quality of life in the metropolitan area reveals that even though city dwellers and suburbanites are different, they are basi-

cally satisfied with their respective life-styles. In fact, two out of three persons questioned said they were almost, if not completely, satisfied with their lives as a whole.

THE STUDY also disputed the common stereotype that suburbanites bask in the knowledge of their personal safety while Detroiters wait in terror behind barred doors.

The survey showed that although public safety is of great concern to both groups, Detroit residents feel just as safe as suburbanites.

Willard Rodgers, one of the members of the research team involved in the study,

says, "We asked Detroit residents how they thought their own neighborhood compared with others in Detroit in terms of crime. About half thought that their neighborhoods were less dangerous than average."

Rodgers adds, "This can be interpreted as meaning that people tend to underestimate the danger in their own neighborhoods as compared with the city as a whole; or it may mean that people tend to underestimate the danger of areas with which they do not have personal experience."

ACCORDING TO RODGERS, persons living in the suburbs responded the same way. Suburbanites were asked to compare their own neighborhoods with others, not including Detroit, in the metropolitan area. "Only one person in 40 thought that their neighborhoods were more dangerous than average," Rodgers says.

"We do not wish, of course, to deny the existence of a crime problem in Detroit or to minimize the fears that are felt by area residents. But we do wonder how much of the flight from the central city is a process that has fed more on itself than by the level of actual danger that would be encountered by those working or shopping in the downtown area," he adds.

The notion that Detroiters keep a large arsenal in the bedroom closet was also dispelled by the study. Actually more suburbanites than Detroiters own firearms. Fifty per cent of the suburbanites interviewed owned guns compared with only 35 per cent of Detroit residents. Most of the suburbanites said their guns were for hunting.

The study also showed that once the suburbanites got out of the city, they weren't inclined to go back even for a visit. A full

66 per cent said they would avoid going to downtown Detroit because they are concerned about crime.

Apparently suburbanites are more afraid of crime in Detroit than its residents are.

THE REAL dividing line between the city and the suburbs seems to be a matter of economics. According to the National Consumer Finance Association, more than two-thirds of all metropolitan families earning more than \$25,000 a year now live in the suburbs. The Detroit metropolitan area is no exception.

The Michigan Economic Institute (MEI) estimates the average annual income per household in Birmingham at \$24,838. More than 13 per cent of those living in Birmingham earn in excess of \$50,000 per year.

Livonia's annual per household income is estimated at \$22,140 by MEI, and more than 32 per cent of families living in the community make between \$25,000-\$50,000 a year.

That's a big jump up from Detroit's annual income per household, which the MEI says is \$13,983. In fact, 13 per cent of Detroiters are estimated to be making less than \$3,000 per year.

MEI retail sales estimates also show that those who have it, spend it. The institute estimates that Troy residents spend about \$25,311 per household each year on retail merchandise. Detroit retail sales average \$5,966 per household.

Livonia residents appear to be thrifter than those living in Troy. Although the annual income per household for both communities is about \$22,000, the MEI estimate of retail spending per household in Livonia is only \$13,762.

Chances are good that a lot of that suburban spending is on homes. The greatest share of the influx of population into such rapidly growing areas as Troy and Canton Township are moving into single-family

homes rather than apartments or condominiums, according to SEMCOG's population and occupied dwelling units 1976 statistics.

THE REGIONAL PLANNING agency's report shows that as of last December, 829 building permits for private homes were issued in Troy, compared with only 69 permits for multiple dwelling units.

In Canton, 810 private home permits were issued. No multiple dwelling permits were reported as of December.

Statistics released by the Wayne County Office for Industrial and Commercial Development (OICD) show other differences between Detroit residents and suburbanites. Skilled workers comprise 38 per cent of Detroit's work force, while Livonia has 31 per cent in managerial and professional fields.

OICD statistics also show the suburbs attract a younger crowd. More than 90 per cent of Livonia residents are under 54, compared with 78.4 per cent under that age in Detroit.

The differences don't stop here. The National Consumer Finance Association has found that 60 per cent of all college graduates live in the suburbs, and about 55 per cent of those with no high school diploma live in the city.

In spite of all the talk about suburban swinging, the association also says almost 60 per cent of those who are divorced or separated live in the city.

DIFFERENT AS the city dweller and suburbanite seem to be, neither seems especially unhappy about the situation. Ralph and Lorraine will make new friends that fit in with their suburban lifestyle.

And who knows? Maybe the John Smyths new neighbors will be a family that moved out to the suburbs and then decided they really like the city best of all.

## Transit battle near peak

The Michigan Senate has passed one version, and the house of representatives was due this week to pass another, of a bill to fund rapid transit construction and reorganize the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) board.

Big battles in conference committee are due over what kind of tax to levy to raise the region's \$12 million annual share of the transit funding and how big a chunk of the SEMTA board will be awarded to the City of Detroit.

Three suburbanites—two in the senate and one in the house—were in the thick of the maneuvering.

STATE REP. W.V. "Sandy" Brotherton (R-Farmington) cast the lone dissenting vote Monday night as the house towns and counties committee passed the version pushed by Chairman William Ryan (D-Detroit). The vote was 8-1.

A full house vote was due sometime between late Wednesday and the end of the week. Brotherton said he was ready with a fistful of amendments to make the newest version of Senate Bill 1375 more acceptable to the suburbs.

Ryan's version would give SEMTA a 15-member board, five appointed by the mayor of Detroit, three for suburban Wayne County, three for Oakland County, two to Macomb County and two to the four smaller counties. This is substantially the plan agreed to by Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and Gov. William Milliken.

Four of the non-Detroit members would be appointed by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments, three by county boards of commissioners and three by the governor.

Ryan's version calls for raising rapid transit funds from the three metropolitan counties of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb. Half would be raised by increasing the motor vehicle transfer tax from \$2 to \$6; the other half by raising the property transfer tax from \$1.10 per \$1,000 to \$3.90 per \$1,000.

BROTHERTON BRANDED the bill "too damn tough on Oakland County." "Oakland would end up picking up 32 per cent of the total cost. When you compare that to a population that's 21 per cent of the tri-county area, we pick up 11 per cent more of the cost than our population would warrant."

The first-term Farmington representative said the vehicle transfer tax would be fairer than the property transfer tax and promised to seek an appropriate amendment.

Brotherton said population figures warrant shifting one SEMTA board seat from Detroit to suburban Wayne County. He also favors giving SEMCOG more appointment power provided SEMCOG picks persons from lists provided by local officials in cities or counties.

"I'm concerned that the governor or SEMCOG will appoint people from those counties who will have too many business or other interests in Detroit. I would like to inject enough power elements so that no one element can get a stranglehold."

THE SENATE last week gave 22-8 approval to its version of the bill.

Favoring it were state senators Bill S. Huffman (D-Madison Heights), acting chairman of the sponsoring appropriations committee; Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park) and William Faust (D-Westland).

Opposed were senators Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), a member of the appropriations committee; and Donald Bishop (R-Rochester).

The senate version, said Huffman, relied solely on the automobile title transfer tax applied in all seven counties of the region. It also created a 21-member SEMTA board with four Detroit seats.

Huffman dislikes some elements of the house version. "The house is talking a three-county tax. That's a 'bad deal. People in Livingston County and others will use the system."

"To tell you the truth, the tax ought to be statewide," said Huffman.

PURSELL, WHO had agreed to many principles in the appropriations committee meeting, voted against the bill when it was on paper.

"It's a loosely written bill. It's shaky in language," Pursell said. "I didn't like the whole picture."

Pursell said Democratic leaders apparently were planning to agree to anything in the senate, no matter how loosely drawn, in order to get it through the upper chamber. When the plan appears to be to pass the version they really want in the house, get the conference committee to accept the house version and push the conference report through the senate, he said.

## County splits training cost with industry

A split-the-cost campaign to put more unemployed and disadvantaged to work in the private sector has been announced by the Wayne County Office of Manpower.

"Our office will reimburse private employers for half the hourly wages of on-the-job training costs of those unemployed qualifying under Title I of the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA)," said Arthur Lewis, director of the office.

Some of the on-the-job training slots open are in hydraulic valve repair, butchering, glazing and vending machine repair.

The office of manpower will select and match potential participants to employers' requirements, based upon interest and aptitude. Contracting employers will have an opportunity to interview participants and make their selection, Lewis said.

In order to be eligible to participate, employers must have a staff vacancy that

they would be willing to train a participant to fill; have sufficient supervisory staff to provide on-the-job training; be in a field that does not have a large number of laid-off workers; and be willing to hire and retain the CETA participant as a regular employee.

Lewis said that those employers interested in providing on-the-job training should contact the Wayne County Office of Manpower Planning Department at 224-7183.

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# Action on July 6?

## School board eyes cuts of \$2.2 million

Plymouth School Board members Monday began the arduous task of balancing educational needs and dollars in attempts to trim the district's 1976-77 budget.

Although no action was taken at the workshop, school officials listened to the concerns of parents in the Miller Elementary School attendance area and discussed the types of cuts they could enact. Board members are expected to take action on the issue at their July 6 meeting.

Because of the recent defeat of a 4.75-mill (\$4.75 per \$1,000 state equalized value) request, school officials must trim \$2.2 to \$2.6 million from the district's 1976-77 budget, depending on the amount of state aid the district receives.

School Supt. John M. Hoben added one sunny note to Monday's talk of cuts and monetary problems when he told board members that favorable interest rates on a tax loan from National Bank of Detroit will add \$96,200 to the budget. The school district each year is forced to borrow money for the first half of its fiscal year as taxes are collected in December.

But, unless Trustee George Lawton's recommendations to maintain current programs and staff levels until a proposed September millage election is accepted, school officials must cut programs and staff members to achieve a balanced budget.

**RESIDENTS AT** Monday's workshop asked board members to make cuts at Miller Elementary, where the year-round 45-15 program was implemented last year, equitably with cuts throughout the district.

Because of the 45-15 program, two tracks of students at Miller will not complete the 1975-76 school year until July and August. One track will begin its 1976-77 school year on July 14.

"Because of our year-round school program, our children are in the position of being the first to feel the effects of the proposed budget cuts," Miller parents said in a letter to school board members. "As the newest school in the district, we also have the largest percentage of first- and second-year teachers now threatened with layoff."

"We feel that it is vitally important to the continuity of 45-15 and the unique open classroom structure at Miller that our staff remain intact," Miller parents continued. "The layoff of classroom teachers could do irreparable harm to the existing school program. The unusual rapport among Miller teachers and their complete dedication to the open classroom concept has made it possible for Miller to survive and flourish in the face of many obstacles."

"To destroy the core of our teaching staff through layoffs or, perhaps worse yet, to replace our teachers with others who have greater seniority within the district, but not the desire to be in an open school, would be like asking us to begin all over again."

Norman Kee, administrative assistant for personnel, said five or six teachers at Miller have received pink slips. Other teachers will be transferred to the school on the basis of seniority and qualifications.

## Margaret Wilson sees bright movie future

The motion picture industry, like everything else, has made great strides in the past half century. But Margaret Wilson, owner of the Penn Theater, one of the few independent movie houses left in this part of the state, feels that the peak has just about been reached.

"What else can there be?" she asked while leaning back in her cozy little office in the theater. "We have the wide screen, stereophonic sound, great color and classified pictures."

"The only thing I can see in the future is that the pictures will run more to family entertainment and will be youth oriented."

**MISS WILSON** speaks from a long career in the movie business in which she has spent 31 years, the last 12 of which she has been the owner of the theater.

Recalling her start back in 1945, she smiled and said she broke into the business in the days when the comedy team of Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis was at its peak. It was during war time and many of the pictures were stories of battles, and westerns were coming in to their own.

Long before that, there were movies in the old P & A Theater on Penniman that was destroyed by fire several years ago.

And there was what was called a Nicelodian on the site of the present city hall. But that was way back in the early days.

Sitting at her desk, she traced the many improvements in the industry and likened them to the vast changes in journalism and the printing of newspapers.

When told that "The Great Train Robbery" shown in a big tent in the early days of the century, she smiled and advised that was 0 the first full-length picture ever shown.

Then came the trend to the town movie houses where they showed silent pictures in black and white. Oftimes these were accompanied by a sound emanating from phonograph records.

In those days, she said, it was customary to have a piano player and illustrated songs along with the picture and the establishments in most towns were Nicklelets—just a nickel admission charge.

Tracing the history, she recalled that Al Jolson appeared in the first talkie and pictures that were tinted in sepia with colors of green and brown.

After that came the color and in 1954 the public was introduced to the wide screen and stereophonic sound.

**WITH THE CHANGING** times and the trend in the use of four-letter words, she said, came the present rating system.

### Tom Brown seeks 4th term in house

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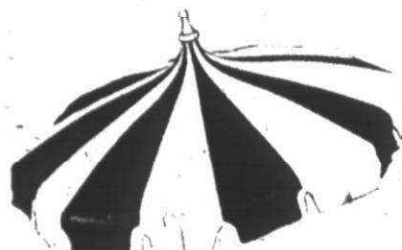
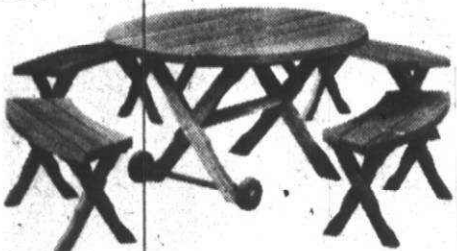
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# Task force schedules public tax hearing

A state task force on property tax revision will hold a public hearing Aug. 13 to give taxpayers a chance to respond to its interim report.

The task force, headed by Lt. Gov. James J. Damman, is studying all aspects of the property tax system and recommending the administrative, constitutional or legislative changes it considers necessary. It is scheduled to present an interim report to Gov. William Milliken early next month.

The report will analyze the present property tax system, reviewing the effectiveness of administration practices, including assessments, equalization and appeals.

Particular emphasis will be given to tax credit programs and other tax relief programs.

Proposals are being studied which would equalize the ability of local communities to provide public service and a review is being made of the property tax as it is used to finance education and its relationship to equal educational opportunities.

The meetings will run from 10 a.m. to noon and 1-3 p.m. in the City-County Building in Detroit. ## Get ready to go fishin' at Newburgh in August

The long dream of transforming three western Wayne County lakes—Newburgh, Wilcox and Phoenix—from little more than mudholes to aquatic beauties and a mecca for fishermen is a step closer to reality.

The first phase of a construction program which has been studied and developed for two years, was started recently when workmen began installing two fishing docks on the shores of Newburgh Lake.

The T-shaped docks will extend 100 feet into the lake and have cross docks 100 feet long. They are to be finished by mid-August.

IN THE FIRST phase, two docks will be installed in Newburgh Lake—one from Newburgh Point and, the other from Sumac Drive—with a third at Wilcox Lake.

The program capped a long drive by State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), who had been working on the project since he was elected to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners eight years ago.

Accompanied by Edwin Mika, superintendent of parks and recreation for the county, Pursell explained that the docks would provide a long-felt need for area anglers.

THE DOCKS will be what are known as "floating docks." They will be stabilized by posts but will rise and fall with the lake level.

"These are the very latest concepts," said Mika. "The fact that they are seven feet wide means they can accommodate quite a number of fishermen."

"These docks will be made of aluminum and will have guard rails to help provide safety for the handicapped," he said.

ANOTHER FEATURE, added Mika, "is that the docks are being manufactured by a firm in Mt. Clemens so much of the money will remain in the state."

Phase two of the program will be dredging the lakes, part of the Middle Rouge River system, to make them a greater recreational asset to southeast Michigan.

The City of Livonia has already gone on record favoring purchase of a side-wheeler to play Newburgh Lake, similar to ones at Camp Dearborn.

A member of the senate appropriations committee, Pursell said the \$199,000 given to the Department of Natural Resources was an effort to balance appropriations with the upper peninsula, which has been getting the lion's share of natural resources funding for years.

"We hope to have another \$199,000 appropriated to make it a continuing program," he said.

IN RECENT months, Newburgh Lake has been stocked with black bass and channel catfish. It is, also due to receive stocks of bluegills, northern pike and black bass.

Installation of the docks, along with the extra 2.8 miles of bicycle paths opened by the county in Hines Park and another 2.8 miles to be provided by the state, will make the three-lake chain one of the most attractive recreational features in the county, according to John Dufour, superintendent of Livonia's parks and recreation department.

"You would have a difficult time matching it around here," said Dufour, "and it is like a dream come true."

## Manning asks for cooperation on county jail

Wayne County Commissioner Richard Manning has asked the assistance of Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and Gov. William Milliken in clearing the way for construction of a new county jail.

Manning, a Democrat from Redford, asked the top two officials in the state to assist the county in extricating itself from the "mess of conflicting state, city and corrections commissions" rules covering the construction of new jails.

County officials have been in a quandary ever since a three-judge circuit court panel issued an advisory opinion that present jail plans do not meet the requirements of Detroit and Michigan building codes.

"The necessity to now redesign to meet what appear to be impossible conditions may not only delay the completion of the new jail but escalate the cost beyond our new millage income."

"Either one or both circumstances would be a terrible disservice to the public," Manning wrote.

He asked both the mayor and the governor to seek amendments to the codes which would permit the new jail to be built with the current plans.

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## 1st Fourth in Detroit was a drag

What was the first Fourth of July like in Michigan?  
Probably not too exciting, according to State Librarian Francis X. Scannell. Records of the time are very sketchy, but with some knowledge of the times and a bit of imagination, a story emerges.  
On July 4, 1776, things were pretty sleepy in the backwater wilderness that would one day be known as Michigan.

IT WAS probably a hot day, as Detroit's 500 European residents wondered about the affairs of the fur trade that year, whether the Indian corn and wheat crops would be good, and if they should have cleared away another acre or so of woods, a mile down the road from the settlement.

Perhaps, as some of the men ducked the noonday sun in a local tavern they discussed the rumors they had heard about trouble hundreds of miles to the east, where their fellow colonists were fighting a revolution of some sort against King George.

There were individuals favoring both sides of the conflict but most Detroiters really weren't too interested in one way or the other. They were loyal British subjects and the British Quebec government, which oversaw affairs of the area later to be named Michigan, had officially adopted a neutrality policy—a policy that would be altered radically a year later when the Royal Government began formulating Indian raids on the settlements north on the Ohio River.

ON THAT same July 4, however, things were hopping at the only other outpost of European civilization in the territory between Lake Michigan and Lake Huron, Fort Michilimackinac. An urgent request had come to the garrison there from the commander of the Fort of Quebec asking for help in lifting the siege of Quebec by rebel colonial forces under Gen. Richard Montgomery and Col. Benedict Arnold.

On that July 4, 1776, a combined force of Chippewa and Ottawa braves under the command of the half-breed Charles Langlade left Fort Michilimackinac, rushing as fast as they could to the aid of Fort Quebec.

When they arrived weeks later however, they would find their efforts had been in vain, the rebellious colonials had withdrawn even before they left Fort Michilimackinac.

BUT ON THAT hot day in Detroit, such matters of international import were just too far away to be of great concern.

The men in the alehouse, no doubt, also discussed the great industrial (though they probably didn't use that word, the Industrial Revolution being decades in the future) breakthroughs that their tiny city was making. Why, they had more than 20 carpenters, masons and blacksmiths busily engaged throughout the city and in a true demonstration of cosmopolitan potential, even a silversmith had recently opened his doors in town.

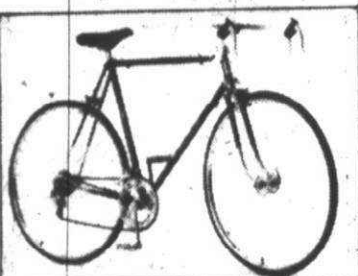
Two hundred years later, near where they sat and drank, more than a million horseless carriages, powered by a technology as yet undreamed, would roll off the assembly line.

WHILE THE MEN were at their cups, the women of colonial Michigan were discussing what to do about the education of their children.

The rich and the officers of the British garrison, of course, sent their offspring to Montreal for schooling, or retained private tutors. Many less well-off French settlers in the area sent their youngsters to the parish priest at St. Anne's to learn ciphering, scibing, some reading and naturally, religion, but most of the British weren't Catholic.

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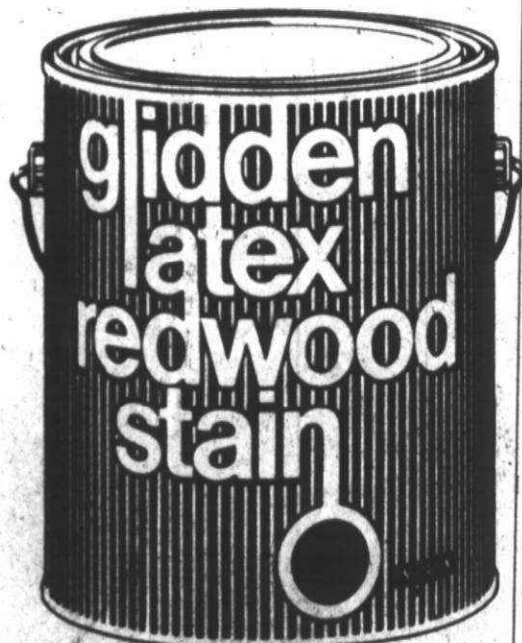


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Harry Stearnes recuperates in his Plymouth home from serious burns received while diving Sunday in the Gold Cup races. (Staff photo by Gary Caskey)

## Amplifiers illegal for CB but may be used by hams

Sometimes you just can't win—and that was the case when we attempted to correct an error that appeared in our Thursday, June 24 edition.

There was a picture of a citizens' band radio in both our Plymouth and Canton editions relating to a story about the high rate of CB thefts in the area.

Unfortunately, underneath the CB unit, there was a linear amplifier, and they are, as we now find out, illegal to manufacture, lease, sell, advertise or use in conjunction with citizens' band radios.

If only we'd known that Monday June 28. That was the day we came back in our Plymouth edition and said the amplifier was illegal unless the citizens' band user has a Class D license.

Having compounded our original error, we received quite a few calls from local CB users, and then the FCC.

The plain fact is that linear amplifiers are illegal in CBs.

They can be used for amateur radio or ham outfits as long as the boost they give the unit doesn't exceed 1,000 watts, and

# Plymouth diver burned at race

Plymouthite Harry Stearnes, a scuba diver, will have good reason never to forget the 1976 Gold Cup races on the Detroit River.

Stearnes was severely burned Sunday afternoon when he dove into the water to save the hydroplane Olympia after it overturned in one of the many exciting moments of the race.

It wasn't flame that scorched Stearnes body, now wrapped in gauze, but the acid-like fuel mixture the racers use to propel the powerful boats.

Stearnes was rushed to Bon Secours Hospital, where he was found to be suffering from second and third degree burns on his arms and upper body.

After two hours of being soaked in ice cubes, Stearnes returned home, even though his doctors advised against it.

Speaking from his home at 44549 Clare, the dedicated diver told how the speedboat's tank had sprung a leak and that diving into the water to save the boat was like swimming in a lake of acid.

"The people on that boat must have been using some exotic fuel because it sure did burn," he said.

Sunday's race, won by Miss U.S., was the third that Stearnes has covered as part of the pit crew. And this year's race was one of the most hazardous of all time.

Stearnes was one of three divers who suffered injuries during the breathtaking afternoon. Bud Huizing, of Livonia, was burned badly and Bill Schlick, also of Livonia, passed out on a rescue mission. He was overcome when he ingested the special fuel.

Always considered a dangerous course, when the wind whipped up waves last Sunday, the entire three-mile stretch became treacherous.

Stearnes and other members of the diving group worked diligently for two weeks prior to the race getting the buoys set and the pit area arranged. Along with this, they also had several practice sessions to be prepared in case of accident. But no one figured on diving into the skin-searing fuel.

Ironically, the 1976 race may have been the last on the Detroit River as the course now is considered too dangerous for these 175 m.p.h. speedboats that leap across the surface of the course.

Years ago, in fact it was after the famed 1931 race, the late Gar Wood notified the Speedboat Association, that the course was too dangerous and moved his 1932 defense of the Harmsworth to Lake St. Clair—just off the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club.

And this was in the days before the divers used exotic fuels that caused Stearnes severe burns.

they can be used for police and fire—but that's the legal limit.

ACCORDING TO Don Curry, senior engineer of the Detroit field office of the FCC, it would take a good deal of modification to make an amplifier intended for ham radio usage into one that boosts the output of a citizens' band radio.

That's why he says they are illegal to manufacture for CB usage.

And apparently the government means business, because the fine for a licensed CB operator is \$100 per day up to \$500 and for an unlicensed CB user, the maximum penalty is a \$10,000 fine and up to two years in jail.

The legal limit for CBs is five watts of output, and according to Curry, a linear amplifier can boost that power as high as 1,000 watts.

The result is "that it creates excessive interference to other users and television and radio sets as well," Curry says.

"They're trampling all over other people."

Curry wouldn't speculate as to why a CB user might book up a linear amplifier to his set other than to suggest that it gives the CB user the capability to break into the airwaves anytime he wants to.

"We've been having a lot of problem with them," Curry said, "but the use of the linear amplifiers is decreasing, and we just want to make sure the public has the right information about them."

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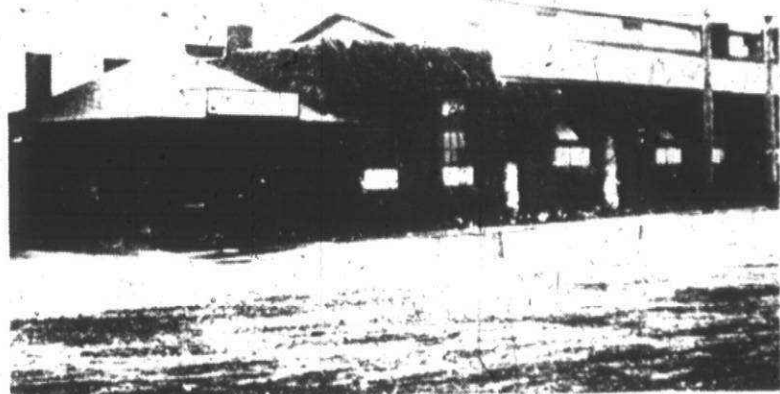
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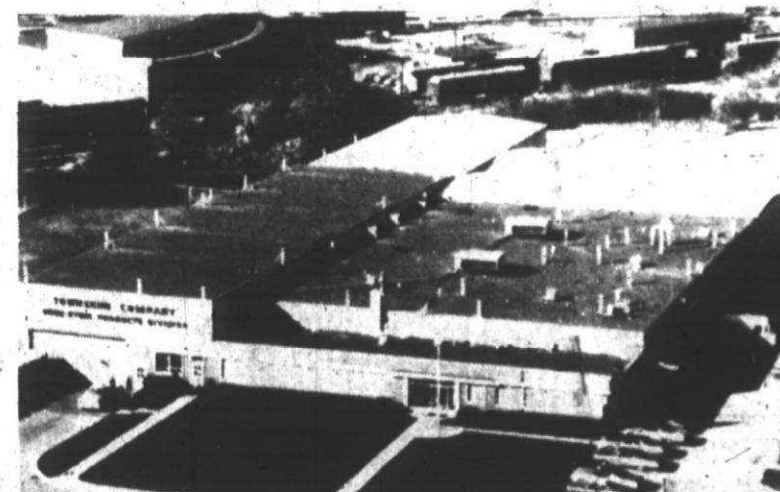
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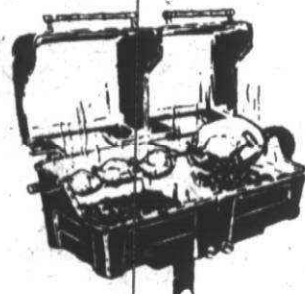

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# The Declaration is fresh, alive and working

It's news that affects us in the suburbs even today.

That's why we made the Declaration of Independence the lead story on page 1 of today's Observer & Eccentric.

The Declaration bluntly spells out the principles of government that we cherish in our community in 1976, just as they were cherished by 50 sweating delegates to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia 200 years ago.

We're for self-government today, both for the nation and for the individual communities within it. We will govern ourselves with our own legislative bodies, courts and administrations.

We will levy no taxes without the consent of the governed. Less than three weeks ago we exercised that revolutionary principle of government as we decided school tax matters.

We believe local government is a natural thing for a community, just as a group of colonists scattered along the Atlantic seaboard 3,000 miles from the mother country believed self-government was a natural thing for them. They "assumed among the powers of the earth the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and nature's God entitle them . . ." They did not need a sovereign's permission.

Yes, the Declaration of Independence is valuable and newsworthy information today.

IT'S MEMORABILIA, too—something you may want to save.

Every family saves some things from the paper, be it the inauguration of a favorite president, a letter to the editor, an engagement announcement.

This non-commercial bit of memorabilia may

make an excellent addition to your own family time capsule. Your descendants, opening the capsule at the tricentennial, will see how all of us felt about the Declaration and how we lived in 1976. You could include a snapshot of your family and a record of your own observance of the nation's 200th anniversary.

IT'S NEWS, the Declaration of Independence. And like most news, it's imperfect.

The Declaration doesn't report how Virginia and South Carolina delegations switched to support it at the last minute, that Delaware's third man rode through a thunderstorm to break his delegation's deadlock, and that New York abstained.

Thomas Jefferson, who wrote the first draft, glossed over the business reasons for "the separation" and concentrated on the abuses to human rights.

The Declaration repeatedly indicts King George III, never hinting that much of the colonists' dissatisfaction was with Parliament, too.

IT IS A CAUSE for celebration, this Declaration of Independence, as much today as it was when published on July 4, two days after it was approved.

Massachusetts Delegate John Adams said the anniversary should be observed with as much noise as possible.

It is recorded that crowds gathered in Easton, Pa. and greeted the reading of the Declaration with three loud huzzas.

May your reading of this extraordinary, lofty, and just plain nervy statement in your homes and local celebrations this year elicit the same uproarious response.

### 'The Spirit of '76' isn't a guardian angel

There will be a lot of festive celebration this weekend as residents of the Plymouth-Canton community join the national observance of America's 200th birthday.

Hopefully, the festive mood will linger July 6 when the parade, fireworks, barbecues, family picnics and weekend trips are over.

Unfortunately, on July 4 and similar holidays, we sometimes let down our guards, and safety takes a back seat to good times. Tragedy has sometimes marred July 4 with loss of life by drowning, automobile accidents, family quarrels, or serious burns from firecrackers and sparklers.

Although the observance of Independence Day will be more festive than usual in 1976, there is no reason to believe that the bicentennial spirit will protect us from holiday tragedies and injuries of other years.

SO IF YOU are spending the weekend out-of-town and will be on the highways, leave yourself extra time to cope with heavy traffic for the trips there and back.

Take your time, stay within the speed limits, and be alert. Someone will be killed on the highway this weekend. Avoid being a statistic.

Instruct your children not to throw sparklers in the air. Teach them to use caution when holding lighted sparklers when other youngsters are nearby.

Remember that firecrackers are illegal in Michigan for a reason—because they are dangerous and can cause loss of fingers or serious burns. It would be better, and safer, to watch the fireworks Sunday night from the Burroughs parking lot.

You may not have thought of it, but a very dangerous place on holidays is backyards and family rooms. When families and friends join for a holiday picnic, and alcohol runs freely, the basic ingredients are there for an explosive family squabble. Each year a look at the police blotter after a holiday will reveal a number of efforts to quiet family trouble. When tempers flare, sometimes a spouse is injured or killed. Be aware of this possibility and stay off the blotter.

## Wondrous experiment is still blazing

On Monday we will celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of our country.

For those inclined to a negative cast of thought, our ceremonies are inauspicious.

The events of the bicentennial itself are a strange, jerry-built mixture of the obviously commercial (remember the proposed red, white and blue Coke bottles?) and the concoctedly grandiose (endless hours of speeches are planned at Independence Hall, in Philadelphia).

Our country is said to be in crisis, unsure of its identity and role in the world and incapable of solving its own problems at home. The democratic form of government we espouse seems increasingly to be in a minority of the world. The promise of an open society at home is supposedly made a lie by our failure to bridge the gaps between the races and the rich and the poor.

Our social structure is said to be collapsing, with the decline of the family, the collapse of the cities and the rootlessness of the neighborhood. Our leaders are supposedly revealed as men and women of low principle, oscillating between greed, lust and self-interest. Our political system is allegedly unable to distinguish between the shrill pleadings of special interest groups and the general needs of our people at large.

All of this—and more—is no doubt true.

BUT IT SEEMS to me that on the eve of our 200th birthday it might be worthwhile to reflect on what remains of the bright hopes of this new land after two centuries of experience. I am convinced that much, so very much, has endured—tempered by age, made rich by experience and blazingly relevant in hope—so as to make America that last, best experiment, for the future of man on this earth.

Liberty. The guiding proposition of the United States has been an overriding commitment to personal liberty. And although many can with justice criticize the limitations to personal liberty that a heavily populated, post-industrial society brings, any fair comparison shows Americans at an advantage. In China, for example, the local street committee decides which woman will be the next authorized to have a child.

Free speech. Required by liberty and necessary for its existence, free speech is alive and well in America. A visitor to my home from Czechoslovakia recently remarked on the variety of views in American newspapers and magazines. "In my country," she smiled, "we find it necessary to read only one newspaper, as there can be only one official line." Certain elected officials these days might have occasion to sympathize, but no one is seriously challenging our people's right to full and free debate.

PERSONAL MOBILITY and equality of opportunity. These are other corollaries to our stress of liberty. Men and women are free to make it in this country, unhindered by race or religion or

wealth to a degree simply unknown around the world.

In this connection, I like to think of a general contrast between American literature, in which the key scenes always seem to take place out in the open and under a vast blue sky and the writings generated in class-ridden Great Britain, whose key episodes most usually happen in low-ceilinged rooms with a dense fog outside.

Involved in our personal mobility is the comparative success Americans have had in breaching class barriers. True, old money and old blood still masquerade too much for energy and competence. But the Soviet Union—supposedly the model for the new, classless society—has managed to create a new, bureaucratic class which is strangling the society just as surely as the French aristocracy destroyed theirs.

Voluntary institutions. Lastly, we Americans have managed to create a dazzling set of local, voluntary institutions, free of government control and cant. The League of Women Voters and the

local school board, the Rotary Club and the church supper group, the subdivision association and the Little League—the list goes on and on.

These are groups which were created to meet a need, not handed down by history or ordered by a central government. They are populated by a people who wish to become involved, unordered and unbound. They are what most impressed Alexis deTocqueville nearly 200 years ago when he wrote his great work on the new America, and they are what give a special quality and texture to our life today.

PATRIOTISM HAS become unfashionable in the last 20 years, probably because its self-appointed keepers consistently confused it with agreement with their own particular fads. They have done us all a great disservice.

For real patriotism—love for and pride in one's country—is not something to wear on your sleeve. It is rather a quiet, individual feeling, to be savored individually, whether in the midst of the crowd at a ball game as the national anthem is sung or standing quietly on a hill as the sun sets over fields of waving grain.

It is something intangible yet deep, much akin to those things that make America such a wondrous experiment in the process of the untolding of the individual.

And so, on the threshold of our nation's third century, let me urge each of us to pause for just a moment to let swell that feeling of pride in our land, our past and our future.

## Kickbacks alive and kicking

Morality is a funny word in the world of politics.

Washington discovered that some foreign politicians were taking kickbacks on orders from American manufacturers such as Lockheed Aircraft. They criticized the American corporations for bribing foreign officials, although that seems to be the standard way of doing business in some foreign lands.

Here at home in Michigan, apparently, political kickbacks are neither illegal nor immoral.

It has come to light that the Secretary of State's office franchises branch offices to sell license plates. The person who runs the branch must pick up all the expenses of operating the branch office; he is paid 40 cents for each set of automobile license he sells and 25 cents for each boat or off-road vehicle he registers.

It has been alleged through the years that it is much cheaper for the state to operate on this commission basis than to have full-fledged, state-operated Secretary of State offices throughout the state.

IT HAS NOW come to light that these franchises do not come cheaply.

It is said to be part of the understanding of a person who receives a franchise that he will contribute around 10 per cent of his gross receipts to any political organization that Secretary of State Richard Austin chooses, whether it be his own campaign or the Democratic Party.

These branch managers pay into campaign coffers more than \$160,000 a year. Since he has been secretary of state, they have paid his political organization almost a quarter of a million dollars.

This obviously means that the people who buy license plates are helping to support one political party of the State of Michigan.

IF THESE BRANCH managers can afford to pay this \$160,000 a year, of course, it means they are making something for themselves.

On this basis, it becomes obvious that the people of the state are being ripped off by at least that amount of money and could pay that much less for license plates or the state could have that much more in its general fund if the system were not one of political patronage.

Austin claims he doesn't know very much about the system and that it was set up by his predecessor, James Hare.

Since one of his chief assistants, Walter Elliott, is in charge of setting the amount that each branch manager must contribute, Austin is either naïve and not running his office, or he is simply not telling the truth.

IT HAS TO BE troubling to the people of Michigan to find out that we have our own Watergate here. But the difference is that in the Washington Watergate, people did not receive money for their own personal benefit or for their political benefit. The legislature must act immediately to end this spoils system and bring some integrity back to the administration of the Secretary of State's office.

We have to let the world know that our government will not tolerate kickbacks by American industry to foreign politicians, even though it has no effect on our governmental finances or our officeholders' dignity.

To allow political kickbacks to exist in our state makes us hypocrites.

## Greenstein responds to police criticism

Editor:

Open letter to the people of Canton Township. It has come to my attention that there exists a definite need for clarification with reference to the reserve officer training program in Canton Township.

The facts are as follow: All reserve officer candidates must successfully complete the 100-hour basic law enforcement training course offered by the Southeast Michigan Police Reserve Training Council at Schoolcraft College which includes NRA weapons certification.

Canton, over and above this training, has established an additional approximate 50 hours or more training for each cadet officer including a second NRA pistol certification course; in excess of 16 hours road patrol training and instruction with the Wayne County Sheriff; additional hours in a State Police vehicle, as well as additional in-classroom training by private instructors obtained through the township.

No police reserve officer will be allowed to carry any weapon other than that as-

signed and approved by the board of the township.

Although the official weapon for the reserves, for safety purposes is a .357 magnum frame, as recommended by the Director of the Southeast Michigan Police Reserve Training Council, the actual weapon is reduced to a .38 police special, because of the ammunition which is mandated by department rules and directives.

The magnum frame allows for a thicker barrel and heavier weight weapon, while the cartridge size matches that of a Michigan State Police, the Detroit Police Department, and the Wayne County Sheriff without the danger of magnum size penetration, or velocity.

The appointment of Carl Silvers, a 25-year retired veteran of the Detroit Police Department, as commander of the reserve unit will insure continuing and continuous training of the reserve officer even after graduation from the Reserve Academy at Schoolcraft College so that the entire career of the reserve officer will, in effect, be a continuous training effort.

The prime duty of the Canton reserve officer will be as public service officer within the community to aid and assist the citizens of Canton Township. They are to be highly visible on your streets and in your neighborhoods as a deterrent to crime and as added enforcement to the public peace and quiet of our area.

The last point which I would like to make is that the Canton reserve officer does, in no way, replace the state police or the Wayne County Sheriff as the prime law enforcement agency.

The reserve police officer will augment and assist those enforcement agencies and will be in addition to and not in replacement of either the sheriff or state police.

It is my hope that the citizens of Canton Township will give these citizen volunteers an opportunity to prove their worth and dedication to the community which is exemplified by the many, many hours already donated at no compensation to the people of Canton Township.

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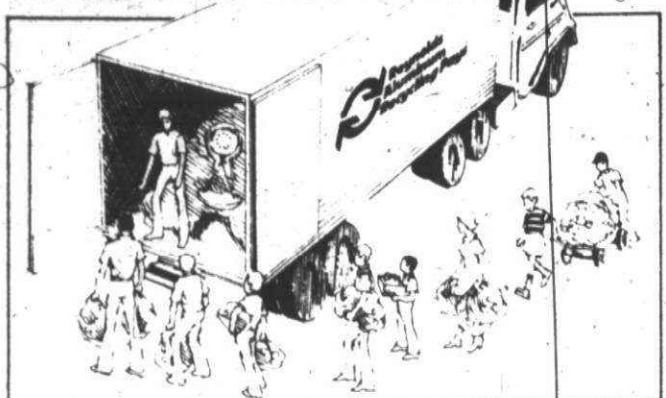

## Kelley files suit against 6 agencies

Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley announced that he has filed suit to collect over \$500,000 in unpaid taxes from six of the nation's largest insurance companies.

Michigan law requires all out-of-state insurers to pay a tax on the premiums collected from their customers. In addition, a 1965 attorney general's opinion requires the companies to include the cost of insurance benefits to company employees in the gross premiums.

Kelley's suit, filed in Ingham County Circuit Court, charged that none of the six company employees in the gross premium companies had included their employees' benefits since he issued that opinion 11 years ago. He also asked the court to collect interest and penalties.

The listed firms include: Guardian Life Insurance Co., Penn Mutual Life Insurance Co., Prudential Insurance Co., Metropolitan Life Insurance Co., Equitable Life Assurance Co. and New York Life Insurance Co.

Kelley also said that Mutual of New York had not complied with the law either but was not listed in this suit because it has brought suit claiming to be exempt from the Michigan law.

Kelley filed a counterclaim against that request, seeking payment of MONY's unpaid taxes.

## Don't pass a buck before seeing symbol

"One picture is worth a thousand words."

—Old Chinese proverb

From our earliest beginnings man has used symbols to convey messages with meaning. We find symbols in the tombs of the Pharaohs and on the teepees of the Indians. The Bible is filled with symbolism, as are our own nightly dreams.

As we celebrate our nation's 200th birthday, it seems fitting that we should examine the symbolism of the Great Seal. On the afternoon of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776, a committee, composed of Thomas Jefferson, John Adams and Benjamin Franklin, was appointed to design a seal for the United States of America. Six years later, on June 20, 1782, the final design was approved by an act of Congress.

A reproduction of that very seal passes through our hands several times daily, yet few of us ever give thought to it or its meaning.

LOOK CLOSELY at the reverse side of a dollar bill. There, you will see two circles representing the two sides of the Great Seal.

In the circle on the right, we see an eagle with a shield on its chest, holding an olive branch in its right talon and a bundle of 13 arrows in its left. In its beak is a

scroll bearing the Latin inscription "E Pluribus Unum."

On the shield are 13 stripes representing the original 13 states. The olive branch symbolizes our nation's desire for peace, but the arrows signify our ability to defend ourselves if it should become necessary.

Over the head of the eagle are 13 stars breaking through a cloud. (The number 13 again refers to the original states.) These stars are arranged in such a way as to form a large six-pointed star. The overlapping of the two triangles in a six-pointed star represents both our physical and our spiritual natures.

The Latin inscription "E Pluribus Unum" means "one from many," or one nation made up of many states.

THE CIRCLE on the left on the back of the dollar shows the reverse side of the seal.

Here we see an unfinished pyramid. At the top of the pyramid is an eye in a triangle. Over the eye are the words, "An-nuit Cœptis." On the base of the pyramid are the Roman numerals, MDCLXXVI. Underneath all this is the motto: "Novus Ordo Seclorum."

The pyramid signifies the durability and strength, both physical and spiritual, of our nation. It is unfinished, representing that it is incomplete and there is room for more states to come.



The eye in the radiant triangle represents the eye of God. Thus, it puts the spiritual above the material.

The words "An-nuit Cœptis" mean "He (God) has favored our undertaking." "Novus Ordo Seclorum" means "new order of the ages." Both of these mottos are adapted from Virgil.

MDCLXXVI is 1776, the year which our nation was born.

And so, even our dollar bill is more than just a medium of exchange. It symbolizes the concepts on which our forefathers established our nation 200 years ago this Fourth of July.

## Area could lose funds

Seventy-eight southeastern Michigan communities and the City of Detroit have been warned that they could lose more than \$200 million in federal grants for failure to meet state and federal wastewater discharge requirements.

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources issued a warning June 22 that the state would begin enforcement action to revoke Detroit's wastewater discharge permit. Revocation of the permit would automatically cancel any pollution control grant opportunities.

The enforcement action could have other far-reaching effects on southeast Michigan communities, according to William Turney, chief of the DNR's environmental protection bureau. Major industries that now discharge their wastes into the Detroit sewage treatment system suddenly would be subject to individual state-federal water pollution control regulations and penalties; and a possible sewer ban could halt all construction of business buildings, houses and apartments in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties served by the regional wastewater disposal system.

THE DNR's formal notice outlines two major agreements that the Detroit area communities apparently did not meet.

• Failure to submit a complete facilities plan which would bring existing wastewater treatment plants into compliance with state and federal law by a Dec. 31, 1975 deadline.

• Violation of a permit that set interim effluent limitations for several specified pollutants, including oil, suspended solids, phosphorus and fecal materials.

The formal notice and three earlier informal notices were issued to the City of Detroit, Detroit Metro Water Department, Detroit Water and Sewerage Department and mayors of all municipalities tied into the vast Detroit sewage treatment system.

In taking action to begin enforcement proceedings and revoke the discharge permit, the DNR is acting both for the state and as an agent for the United States Environmental Protection Agency, which strongly supports the DNR's action, says Turney.

"IN ADDITION," notes Turney, "the International Joint Commission is complaining that Detroit has fallen far behind in meeting terms of a 1971 international water quality agreement between Canada and United States."

All of those notified by the DNR have been asked to attend a 9 a.m. July 23 hearing in the Law Building Auditorium. Lansing, with the Michigan Water Resources Commission to present their case for why the state-federal permit should not be revoked.

## Candelight tour of Romeo set

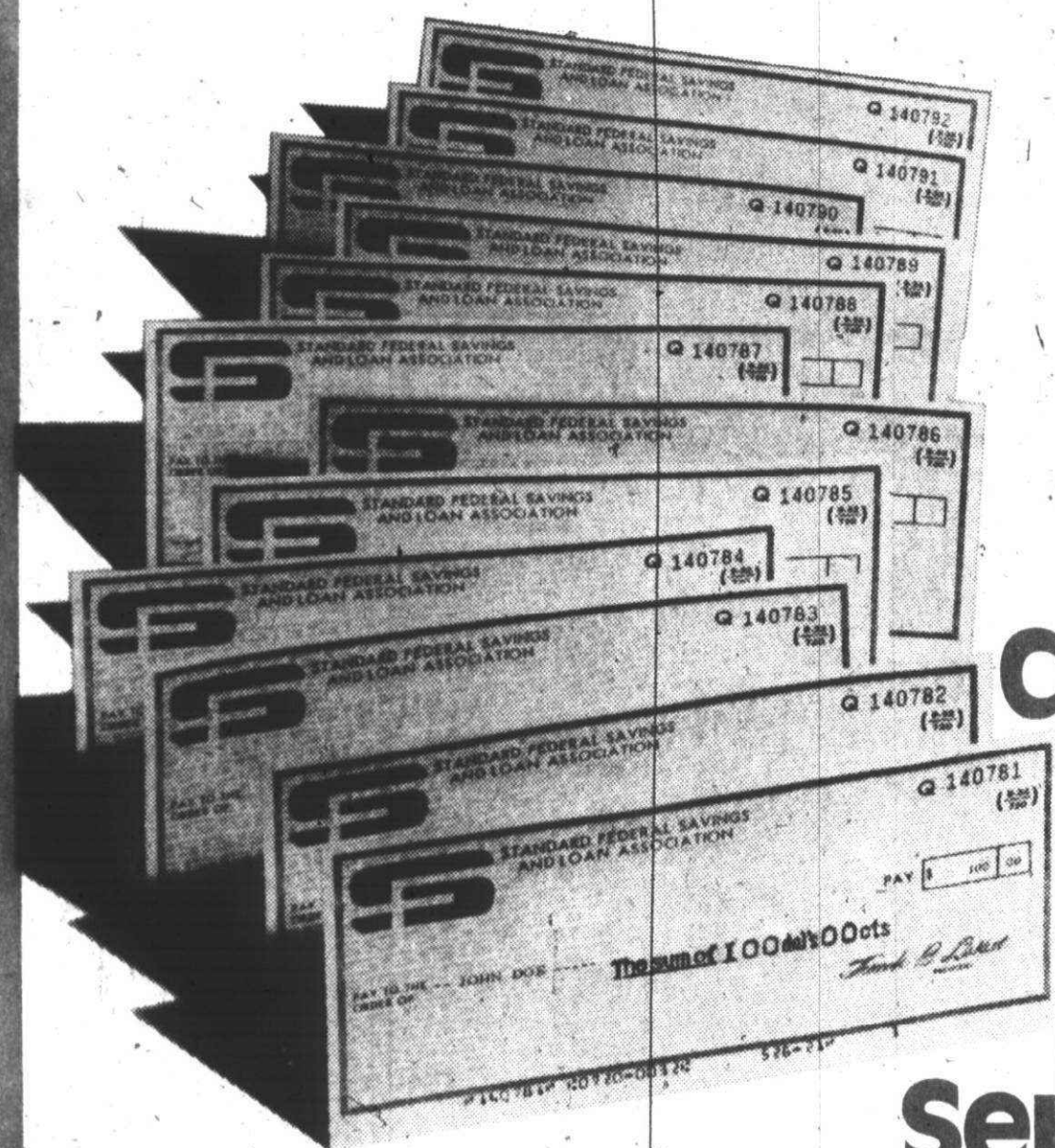
A candelight tour of eight historic Romeo homes is planned from 6-10 p.m. July 3.

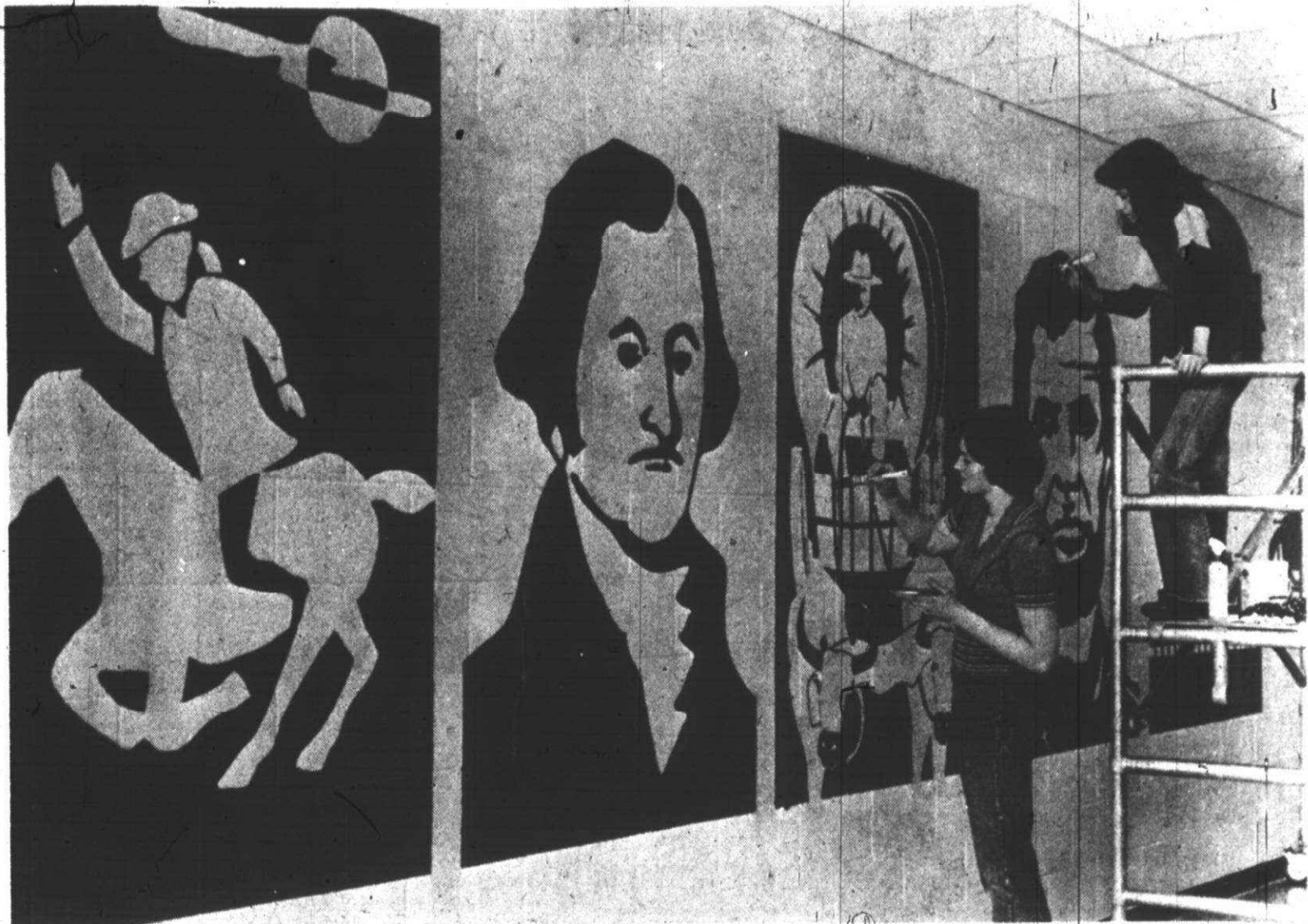

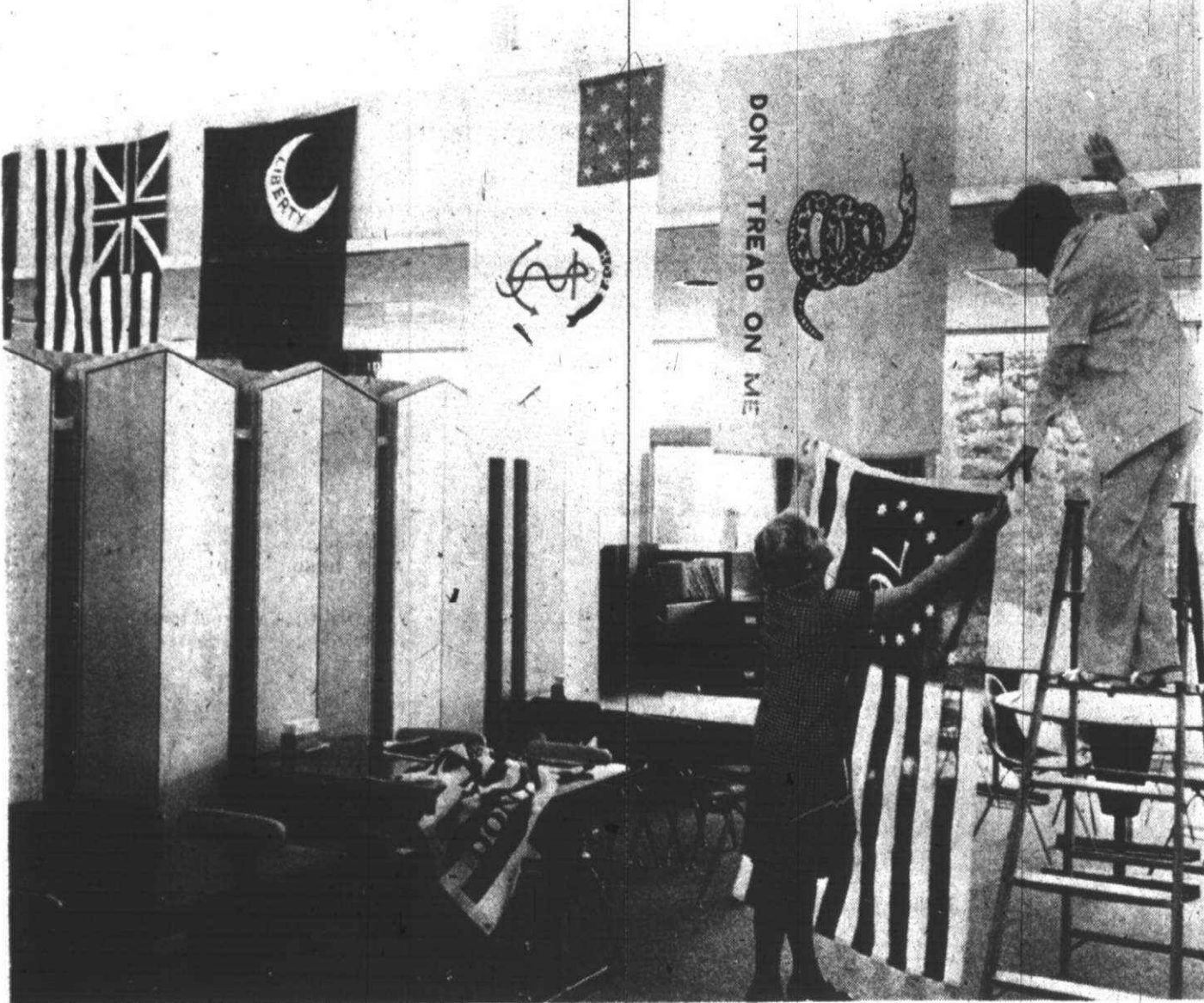

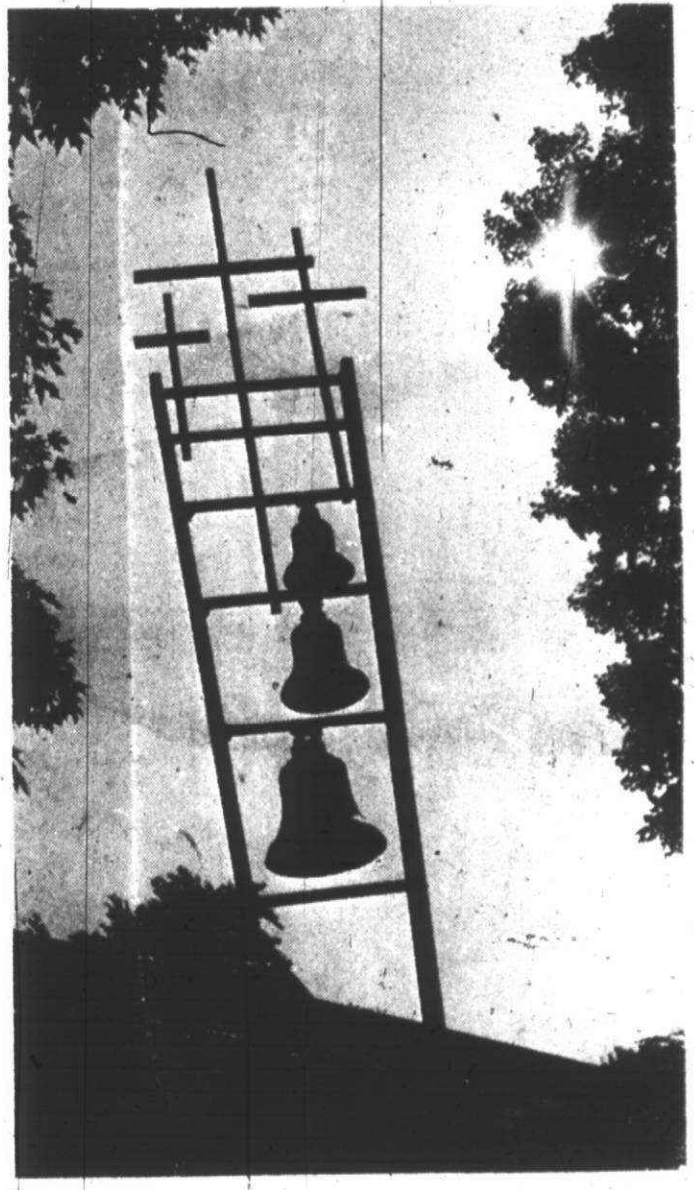

### Home for retarded

## Redford House drive launched

With Plymouth Opportunity House happily past its first birthday, a drive is beginning to fund another living center for retarded adults, this one to be located in Redford Township.

Jan Plas, president of Community Opportunity Centers, the non-profit housing

organization establishing the centers, said letters are going out now to organizations, asking them to continue the generosity that helped make the Plymouth center possible.

The hope is that by the end of the year there can be definite progress toward building a home for 16 working retardates on property that has been acquired for the

purpose on Beech-Daly just north of Our Lady of Loretto Catholic Church.

THERE'S AN ADDED complication in financing the proposed Redford House, Plas admitted to the group that gathered recently to celebrate Plymouth Opportunity House's first birthday.

He explained that funds from a state program called Residential Facilities for the Mentally Retarded, which helped build Plymouth House, currently are tied up.

"Between now and September we hope there will be a commitment from the state agency," Plas said. "If nothing develops by then, we will seek private funding."

In any case, Plas added, by fall the COC would like to have raised the \$13,000 still needed to complete a development fund for Redford House.

Then it could be ready to go ahead on the one-story, U-shaped building which has been designed by William Lindhout, Livonia architect who also drew the plans for Plymouth Opportunity House.

THE REDFORD plans were displayed at the birthday party which drew members of COC, government representatives from Plymouth, Redford and Livonia and leaders of contributing organizations to the Mayflower Hotel luncheon.

Afterwards, the group went to the Plymouth center with director John Chontos to meet some of the residents and housemother Hazel Hutchman and to participate in dedication of a plaque that lists organizations and a few individuals who have contributed to the program.

Plas also mentioned that the COC organization, organized 12 years ago to plan the series of homes, has contributed about \$10,000 to operation of the program in the first year of Plymouth House, and figures that much will continue to be needed on an annual basis.

This funds the kind of services needed by the residents, who either hold jobs or participate in sheltered workshops, he said.

"However, as we build more homes, in

Redford and later Livonia, our program administration expenses should become less per resident," he said.

NOTING THE NAMES listed on the plaque, Plas mentioned particularly the contributions of several organizations.

One is the Plymouth Community Federal Credit Union, which, he said, made a "two-fold donation."

"This organization gave a donation to finish the basement of Plymouth House into a recreation area," he explained, "and it also has pledged gifts over two years to cover a recreational program."

Plas also commended the Redford Suburban League, which had contributed substantially to Plymouth House while it was still in the planning stage and "already has given \$1,000 toward Redford House."

"It's groups like the League and the Plymouth Rotary that make big donations to start things going that are most appreciated," he said.

OTHER ORGANIZATIONS listed on the plaque include the Plymouth Community Fund, Our Lady of Good Counsel parish council, the Order of the Alhambra in Dearborn, the Northwest Association for Retarded Citizens (parent group of COC), and the Lions Club of Plymouth.

The plaque also lists the Plymouth Woman's Club and the Plymouth Garden Club, two groups Plas said had contributed not only money but a lot of volunteer service to the residents.

The list goes on with the Optimist Club of Livonia, the Plymouth Police Officer Association, the Metropolitan Club of Livonia, Veterans of Foreign Wars 6695 auxiliary, the Detroit Association of Motorcycle Clubs, the Lamplighter Lions, the Exchange Club of Northwest Detroit, the Plymouth Women's Civic League and the Father Victor J. Renaud Knights of Columbus Council.

Also on the plaque were two couples, Mr. and Mrs. Julius Zviradin and Mr. and Mrs. William Krebs, and a business, Austin Tube Products, Inc.

## Co-op teachers to be certified

A new state law provides for certification of teachers employed by parent cooperative preschools after they have completed 15 or more hours of child development course work and earned at least 60 semester credit hours in college.

Certification also would be possible for teachers who have been employed by a parent cooperative preschool or co-op nursery for at least five years.

The bill, signed recently by Gov. William G. Milliken, could affect some 450 teachers. There are 350 parent cooperative preschools in the state, with an enrollment of about 15,000 children.

Facilitator Linda Schaber will meet with section II 9-11 a.m. Tuesdays, July 27 to Aug. 17, in the Garden City Harrison center.

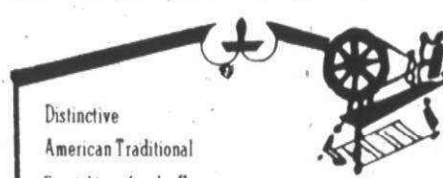
A \$5 registration fee payable to Schoolcraft should be paid in advance, also including name, address, phone and date of birth.

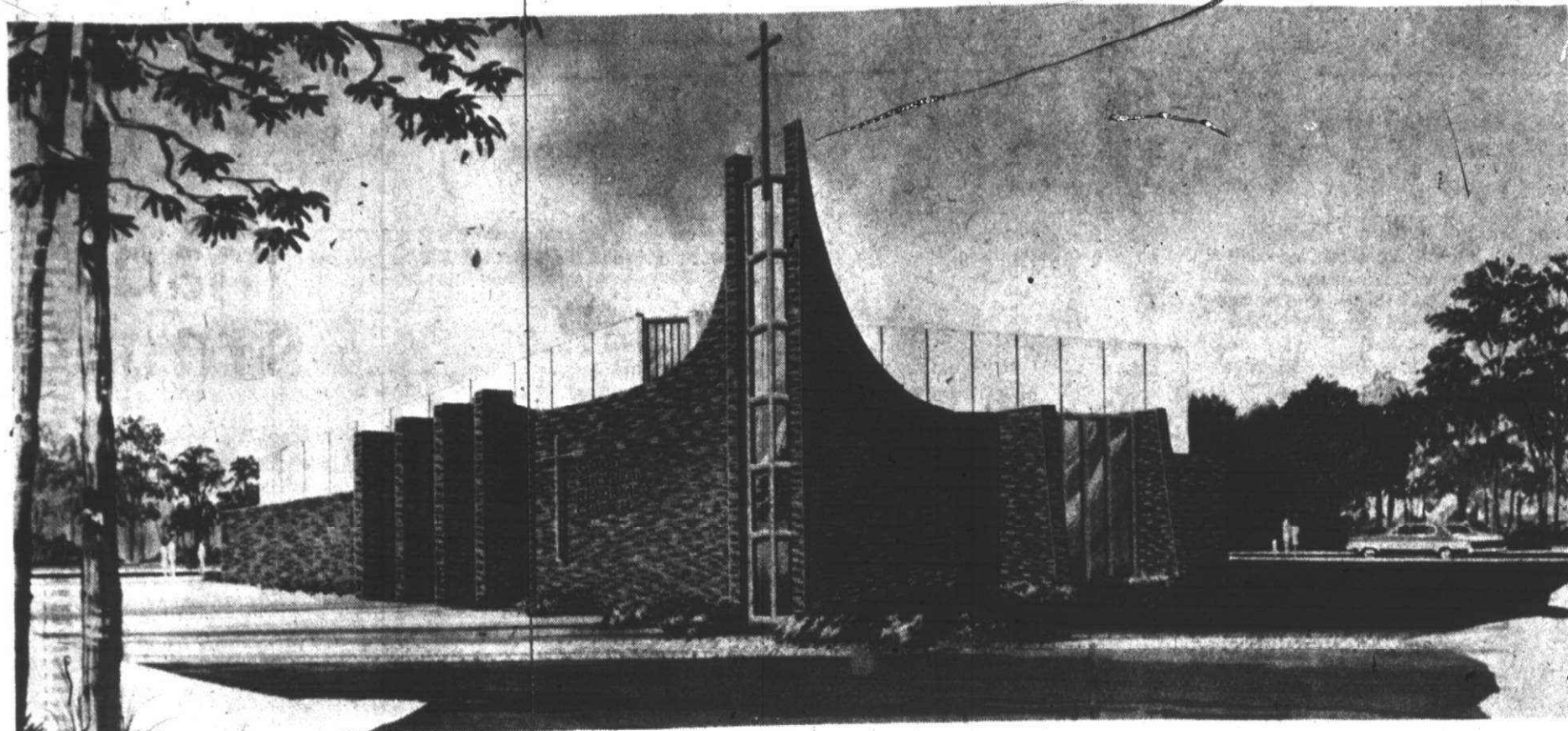

## Good Shepherd plans building

Good Shepherd Reformed Church of Westland is aiming for a fall groundbreaking on a two-phase expansion program designed to serve its projected growth over the next 25 years.

A move on the first phase depends first on denominational approval and then on negotiation of a mortgage for the \$265,000 project.

When completed, it would provide a new sanctuary to seat 300 persons, as well as remodeling of the present structure and construction of a new wing with offices for pastor and secretary, a work room, and a room that might be used by an associate pastor or for counseling.

The plans drawn up for the expansion also include a later phase that would expand the sanctuary to seat 1,500 and add more education and program space at some future date.

**GOOD SHEPHERD**, located at Hunter and Wayne Road, began its expansion program this spring when it received a gift of 4.44 acres adjacent to its original property. That adds up to seven acres available for the church plant.

The church led by the Rev. Kelvin Kronmeyer, then contacted Church Growth Services, an advisory organization based in South Bend, Ind., to begin its program.

A stewardship of life drive was launched for the congregation, numbering about 100 families. The drive, headed by Jeff Langham, was aimed at getting pledges of \$19,500 more than the congregation's present level of giving for a building fund.

By May, when the congregation held a fellowship dinner to culminate the drive, 90 per cent of that figure had been pledged.

**PRESENT AT THE DINNER** was architect Norman L. Bryar, of Church Growth Services, who showed an elevation drawing and a floor plan for the proposed new structure.

The architect explained, according to Rich DeFouw, a member of the stewardship program committee, that many churches make a mistake by planning only one expansion move when they build.

"They complete their first expansion," he said, "and then when the time comes to

grow again they find they have to pay more because some tearing down is necessary.

"Our plans should enable us to move ahead if our growth in future years warrants it."

In addition to the \$265,000 structural costs, the committee estimates about \$36,000 will be needed for furniture and equipment.

Langham, as stewardship program chairman, said pledges from the congregation "more than exceeded expectations."

"Even more gratifying," he said, "is the depth of commitment reflected in the pledges of time, talents and abilities which will serve as a human resource file for the church."

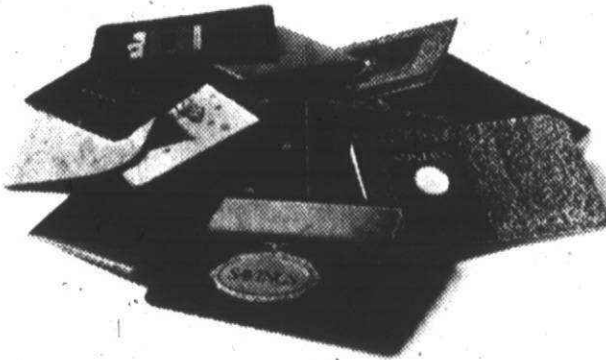

# Village manager doubled as fire truck driver

(Part I)

The council-manager form of government dates back to 1908 when the post of "general manager" was created in Staunton, Va.; but the plan used in Plymouth, and in other cities throughout the country, was inaugurated in Sumter, N.C., in 1912.

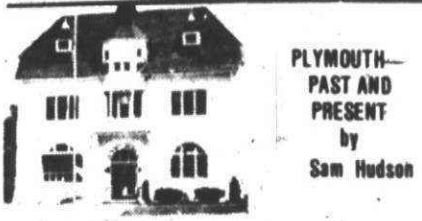
By vote of the people on Dec. 17, 1917, Plymouth became the fifth city in Michigan to adopt the commission-manager plan of government. The new system went into effect here on April 1, 1918—the day Plymouth became a Home Rule Village.

The new charter carried by an overwhelming majority (95-14), but the editor

of the Plymouth Mail said the light vote indicated "a regrettable lack of interest in local affairs."

ON MARCH 29, 1918, William T. Conner, of the hardware store, was elected president of the new commission, and an announcement was made that a civil engineer, with business acumen, was wanted for the new job as village manager.

On May 3, the Mail reported that Gilbert Brown of Detroit had been selected from a number of applicants. Brown, who had been a project superintendent for a Detroit construction firm, was originally from Plymouth. He had a brother who was postmaster here at one time.



Brown was village manager only two years. He resigned a few weeks before June 1, 1920, when his replacement took over. The second village manager, Sidney Strong, was to remain in the community for the rest of his long life and to be of

service to it in many ways beyond that for which he was hired.

STRONG WAS offered the position by William "Daddy" Burrows, the village president who worked at Daisy. The village treasurer at that time was George Richwine, and the village attorney was Paul Voorhies, later to become attorney general of the State of Michigan. The population of Plymouth was about 2,900.

Strong, whom I interviewed on several occasions in 1967, recalled some of the happenings during the seven years in which he served as chief administrative officer of Plymouth.

Water pressure was a continual problem. Residents called to complain whenever the pressure, regulated by the volume of water in the elevated tank behind the Presbyterian Church, ran low. During Strong's tenure, a new pump was installed at the wells on Beck Road. In 1921, a new concrete water reservoir was installed and covered with earth east of Sheldon and south of Six Mile. The village's first sanitary sewers were laid; and a disposal plant was built behind Riverside Cemetery.

WHILE STRONG was manager, that part of Tonquish Creek which crosses Ann Arbor Trail, under the alley which leads to the Central Parking Lot, was covered over. The stream was piped through an egg-shaped conduit, replacing the bridge which frequently washed out during the flood season.

About 1924 or 1925, Strong's job was in jeopardy when a group of local residents began a movement to throw out the council-manager form of government. Strong recalled that those who proposed the change were defeated by a wide margin.

The village seal, which includes a log cabin and the motto "the village of homes," was designed by Village Manager Strong in 1924.

An active member of St. John Episcopal Church here, Strong recalled the visit of Henry Ford and his wife to Plymouth in the 1920s when they came here to watch the men of the church put on a minstrel show. The Fords, said Sidney, came in "a big, black limousine, with guns stacked in the rear seat."

Strong met Ford again when the automobile magnate was negotiating with George and John Wilcox for the purchase of the Wilcox Mill property on which Ford opened an automotive tap plant in 1923. Strong also re-

called that Ford and one of the Wright brothers came here to call on Ed Cutler at his home at the corner of Ridge and Joy Roads. Cutler was "old Henry's architect" during the construction of Greenfield Village. Strong's impression of Henry Ford was "pleasant."

UNTIL 1919, the local fire department, manned by volunteers, had to rely on hand-drawn fire-fighting equipment. In that year, the village purchased its first motorized fire truck. In 1925, when Strong was village manager, the department got its first motor pumper.

A resolution on the village books in 1920 stipulated that the village manager must be a fire truck driver. Strong learned how to drive the truck and performed that duty whenever he was in his office when the alarm rang. On one occasion, when fire broke at Allison's Chevrolet Garage, he managed to arrive at the scene by borrowing a minister's Essex.

Sid Strong's starting salary as village manager of Plymouth was \$1,800. It was \$3,000 before he left the job in 1927. He said his friends at the Soo were amazed when he told them of the high salary he was commanding here. He recalled that he gave up the village manager's job because of "too much politics."

Another long-time resident told me that Sidney's run-in with Village President Harry Robinson, an auctioneer known widely as "the little man with the big voice." A resident had complained of the condition of her sidewalk and Robinson ordered Strong to have it fixed by noon. Strong responded that he had to get his work done according to priority. Noon came; the sidewalk was not fixed; and Sid Strong was out of a job.

## Giza sphinx story told

The mysterious image of ancient Egypt, with its lion body and human head, is explored in a new exhibit, The Changing Face of the Sphinx, which opens today at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

In material dating from 1579 to the present, the Great Sphinx at Giza is examined in every aspect of excavation and restoration with bookplates, drawings, paintings, photographs and cartoons in gallery 147 of the South Wing.

Outside the museum, on the lawn of the John R. street side, is a site sculpture built by Carle Andre from limestone blocks. It is on loan to the institute throughout the summer.

Besides exhibits, the art institute also offers, at no charge, Masterwork of the Week gallery talks by staff members at 1:30 p.m. each Wednesday and Friday at 1:30 p.m. on a different object in the collection each week.

All 101 galleries are open this summer from 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Wednesdays, Thursdays and Sundays, and from 1-9 p.m. Fridays. The museum will be closed, however, Sunday due to the legal holiday.

He and his mates won the team event and the top prize of \$2,500. That gave him a share amounting to \$650.

Following the team event he rolled a 755 in the singles to tie for first place and collected another \$375. Then came an extra \$150 for the 755 that was the actual high three game total and another \$100 for a share of the three game actual count in the team event and a one game total of 1238 that topped the list.

All told Bob collected \$7,125—not bad for a substitute. It was a great reward for being in the right place at the right time.

WELL, THE LONG WAIT is over for Cora Fiebig and she is now officially the women's state singles and all-events champion. More than two months ago she rolled a 683 in the state tournament in Grand

Rapids to take the singles lead and followed with a 1867 to top the all-events, in the actual pinfall division.

Since then she has been waiting as a large number of women bowlers made their assault on the pins. But when the long event ended last Sunday night, her top counts were still the best.

It marked the end of a satisfying season for last year's queen who got off to a slow start this year. Week after week she moved up in the average race. While she

didn't make it to the top, she reached her peak in the state tournament and now, fittingly, is a dual champion.

match game championship back in the 20's and became famous as a three-stepper.

Another three stepper who did very well is Lee Jougard, former member of the Stroh team, who has held the ABC tournament singles record with 775 for the past quarter of a century.

The late John Paulus, popular owner of the old Chene Trombly recreation, in his heyday was the first sponsor ever to send his team by airplane to a bowling tournament.

He also was the originator of the over-average competition that preceded the present handicap system. Many of the all star bowlers would like to go back to over-average competition.

To J.L.S., Plymouth—You're right, the first bowling lanes in the Plymouth were located in what is now the Mayflower Meeting House. They were sponsored by the Elks. Later Lee Butler got control of them and placed them in Lofy's Restaurant on Mill Street before it burned down.

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# Commissioner passes one year mark

On July 1 Fedele F. Fauri marked his first anniversary as racing commissioner of the state of Michigan. He took office in the midst of a strike at Hazel Park Race Track which had horses piling up at Detroit Race Course in Livonia, unable to move on to the Hazel Park meet.

F.F. Fauri handled that situation with an adeptness that was assuring to horse-

men and track management. Consensus of opinion was, "Looks as if we have a good man."

One year later, as Fauri and his staff settle into their new offices at 485 S. Main Street, Plymouth, he has maintained his early reputation.

A native of Crystal Falls, Mich., he received his BA and bachelor of law from

the University of Michigan. He entered private law practice in his home town, and the following year became advisor and general assistant to the County Relief Administration on a part-time basis. From 1934 to 1935 he was connected with rural resettlement in the Upper Peninsula. From 1935-37 he was Upper Peninsula supervisor for the State Welfare Department.

HE WENT TO Lansing in 1937 to serve as legal counsel to the Michigan State Welfare Department, and in 1939 became deputy supervisor of the State Bureau of Social Security in Lansing.

Fauri became supervisor of the Michigan Bureau of Social Security in 1941, and two years later was named director of the Michigan Department of Social Welfare, a post he held for four years. While director, he served as a consultant in public assistance to the ways and means committee of the U.S. House of Representatives in 1945 and 1946.

In 1947 he went to Washington to serve as senior specialist in social legislation for the Legislative Reference Service of the Library of Congress.

From 1948 to 1962 he served as: public assistance research director of the advisory council on Social Security to the Committee on Finance of the U.S. Senate; social security advisor to the U.S. House Ways and Means Committee while it considered the legislation that became the Social Security Amendments of 1950; Social Security advisor to the Senate Committee on Finance; chairman of the Federal Advisory Council on Employment Security of the U.S. Department of Labor; and chairman of the Advisory Council on Public Welfare, U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

All this, while he was dean of the University of Michigan School of Social Work, and a professor of public welfare administration at U-M.

FAURI IS past president of the American Public Welfare Association, the Council on Social Work Education, and the National Conference on Social Welfare.

He received the 1955 award of the National Conference on Social Work for advancing social welfare in the United States, the 1957 W.S. Terry Jr. Memorial Merit Award of the American Public Welfare Association, and the 1968 Distinguished Service Award of the Council on Social Work Education.

He was appointed by former Gov. George Romney to serve on the Governor's Special Commission on Juvenile Delinquency in 1968 and was appointed to the Governor's Welfare Study Commission by Gov. William Milliken in 1969. In 1975 he retired as vice-president for state relations and planning at U-M.

Last July he accepted the racing commissioner post as a favor to Gov. Milliken.

WHERE DID HORSES have a place in his career?

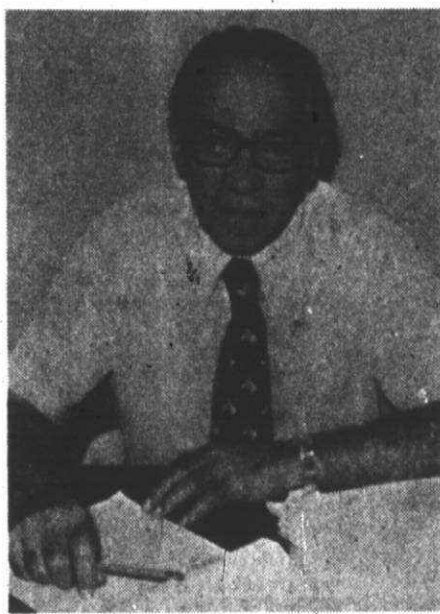
His earnings as a sulky driver for the pacers and trotters paid his way through law school. He owned several race horses but divested himself of his stable on accepting the commission.

Fauri has jurisdiction over the mutual tracks—Jackson, Northville Downs, Hazel Park, and DRC-Wolverine.

With the passing of a state bill to allow quarter horse racing in Michigan, and plans under way for a track in Flint, his responsibilities will increase.

## Smith wants gangs stopped

Deer and rabbits don't seem to be the only kind of wildlife roaming through Hines Park these days.

Concerned with the increasing vandalism in the park, Wayne County Commissioner Royce Smith has called upon the county sheriff's patrol to investigate the damages created by gangs of youths harassing picnickers in the park.

"We need to clean up our parks and make them safe for the residents desiring fun and wholesome entertainment. Drugs

are being sold by dealers from many parts of our state who come to the park to peddle illegal drugs. This type of behavior should never be allowed to continue," Smith says.

The commissioner suggests that a "Clean-Up-The-Park Day" involving local youths should be held. "This type of action would solve many of the problems within the park, and promote better relations with the community," he adds.

## Food stamps cost more

Social Security recipients who also qualify for food stamps may find they will have to pay more for their food stamps this month when a 6.4 per cent hike in Social Security benefits takes effect.

Because the cost of food stamps depends on the amount of net household income, the July boost in Social Security may also increase the amount a family must pay for food stamps.

However, the increase in the Social Security check will not affect the cost of

stamps for those households which received less than \$391 from Social Security before July.

For any household whose total increase in income amounts to less than \$25 a month, U.S. Department of Agriculture regulations permit delaying the adjustment in the cost of stamps until the next certification or until other changes occur which make the total more than \$25.

The \$25 limit applies to the total benefits of all household members.

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
