## Sheriff, state police noncommittal

# Union chief rips reserves

While antagonism towards Canton's reserve police department continues to surface at home, the township's official law enforcement agencies have maintained a "let's wait and see" attitude.

Spokesmen for both the Wayne County Sheriff and Michigan State Police, while admitting some concern over the reserves, have remained noncommittal—unlike the union for the sheriff's deputies.

The union has taken a hard line against the reserve force.

"You know, we can't really project what will happen," explained Lt. William Tomczyk, commander of the Plymouth state police subpost.

"We haven't sat down with (Supervisor Robert) Greenstein although he has said we should discuss the plans, so I don't really know what to expect."

"If they call us, we'll help them, but other than that, we intend to stay out of it. I won't attempt to speak for the residents of Canton," Tomczyk added, "but if they didn't want the reserves, I imagine they could have said that."

"But I'll say this much, it will probably lead up to a township police department—there's little question about that."

SENIOR INSPECTOR Richard Novak, head of the sheriff's road patrol, said he

had some serious concerns about the reserves, but he admitted he didn't know what, exactly, the scope of the reserve unit would be.

"The only thing we're doing with them is letting them ride around with us on day shifts in the cars as part of their training. Carl Parsell (township treasurer) and Greenstein asked us to let them ride with us and we agreed."

"We'll give them some basic information, but while they ride with us they can't carry weapons and they have no power."

"Really, I don't know what the program will be. My first understanding is that they were set up as an ordinance division and that they were going to serve as the eyes and ears of the community."

"As for their riding around, that's all well and good, although any citizen can do that. But if they're going to be making arrests, I'm not so sure about that."

"If they call us and tell us something's going down that's fine—more eyes on the road will be beneficial—but I hope they won't be chasing cars."

"If they do, that will be their bag—we won't take any responsibility for that."

According to Greenstein, the philosophy behind the reserves is one of "augmentation, not replacement."

He has said on several occasions that the reserves will be told not to confront criminals or attempt to make arrests unless there is a serious threat to public safety.

THE SUPERVISOR said the sheriff or the state police will be called in whenever possible.

Greenstein said it was his understanding from talking to the radio supervisor, Novak and Undersheriff Loren Pittman that the reserves would be on the sheriff's radio frequency.

He said if not, calls could be relayed from the township's cars through a central township dispatcher to the sheriff.

"If they see something, that's all right," Novak explained, "but what they do after that is the important part and we haven't seen their guidelines."

"If they are going to be writing traffic violations, it won't be through our office."

"There's just a lot of things that aren't clear. I don't think they've worked out the administrative problems—in fact, I think they're just scratching the surface."

"They're working for Greenstein, and frankly, with him being both chief of police and supervisor I think he'll find that it's no picnic."

Novak added, however, that he didn't know how the reserves would contact the sheriff because they wouldn't be using the same radio frequency as the sheriff.

WHILE NOVAK and Tomczyk were withholding judgment until they saw copies of the reserves' guidelines, Jim Akhtar, president of the Wayne County Sheriff's Local 502, was fiercely against the reserves.

"I think it's ill-conceived—putting untrained people out there with more firepower than they can ever use."

"They'll be completely unsupervised. The sheriff won't be dispatching them, and if they get in trouble, it will be on their own."

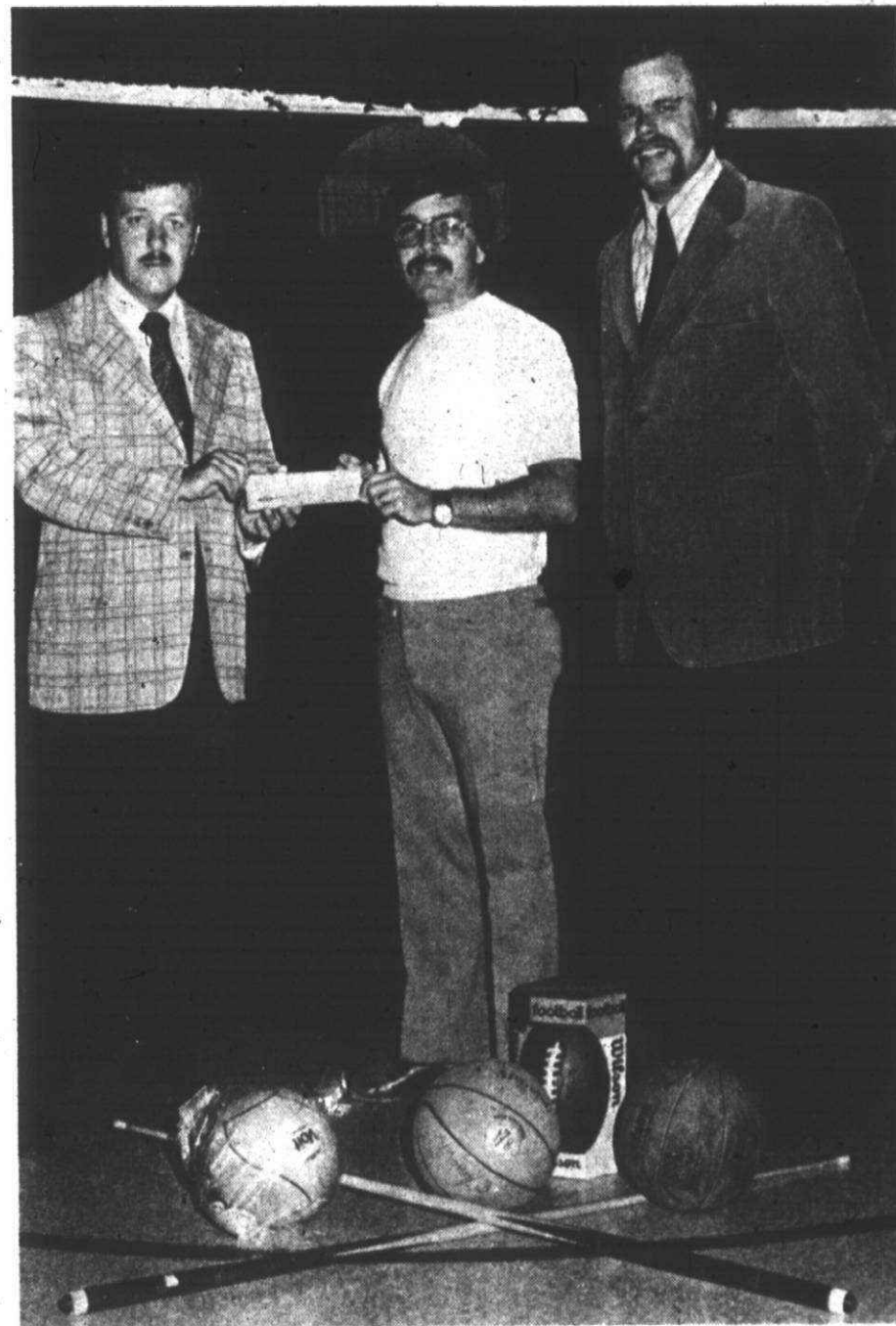
"Our position is that Greenstein will go back to the people in the spring asking for his own police department before the Supreme Court can decide the issue of the road patrol and the townships."

Akhtar, who said he is actively backing the Stein slate running against Greenstein in the Aug. 3 primary, said, "A reserve department is no police department at all. It's a bunch of unsupervised vigilantes running unsupervised in Canton Township."

Akhtar said his position on the reserves, although the official union stance, was not based on fear of lost work.

## In close ballot

# Gray elected to chair

Joe Gray was elected president of the Plymouth Board of Education by a 4-3 vote Thursday night.

Only one ballot was needed to decide the chairmanship at the board's annual election. Gray and Marcia Borowski were nominated and the majority quickly fell behind Gray.

Supporting Gray were E.J. McClendon, Mrs. Flossie Tonda and Richard Arlen with Ms. Borowski being backed by Tom Yack and George Lawton.

McClendon was then elected board vice-president. Mrs. Tonda secretary, and Arlen was elected treasurer.

ALTHOUGH THE board's bylaws were suspended by a 7-1 vote to allow for voting to be done by a secret, paper ballot, there was nothing really secret about how individual trustees voted.

The four votes for Gray had been lined up by telephone before Thursday night's organizational meeting at Plymouth Canton High. Gray said he asked McClendon by phone to take the chairmanship instead, but McClendon declined the day before because of the pressures of his job at University of Michigan. And so when the first ballot was taken, the slate of four quickly cast votes for Gray.

After observing that the four votes had been prearranged, Lawton cast his votes with the slate for the other three offices in recognition that to vote otherwise would be pointless. On the balloting for the other three offices, Yack voted for Lawton and Ms. Borowski voted no rather than casting votes for the slate.

Following the vote on Gray, Yack nominated Ms. Borowski for vice-chairperson but she declined. Mrs. Tonda, supported by Arlen, nominated McClendon.

The only sharp exchange in the election

process followed the vote for vice-chairman. Ray Hoedell, acting as secretary for the election, read the results as five votes for McClendon, one for Lawton, and one anonymous. "I beg your pardon, Ray, that one vote was for Mickey Mouse," remarked Ms. Borowski. "I think that remark wasn't called for," responded Gray.

Yack then nominated Lawton for secretary. Lawton declined and said: "We might as well continue with the slate, and so I will nominate Flossie Tonda for secretary." The vote was five for Mrs. Tonda, one for Lawton, and one no. Mrs. Tonda, supported by Lawton, nominated Arlen for treasurer and he was elected with five votes, one for Lawton and one no.

AFTER THE election of board officers, there was some discussion about whether the voting had been proper as the decision to cast secret ballots wasn't unanimous.

Ms. Borowski raised a point of order that a unanimous vote of the board was needed to suspend rules. She and Yack had voted against the motion to suspend rules and cast secret ballots.

Arlen read from Robert's Rules that rules could be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the board, or with five yes votes. Supt. John M. Hoben said he believed the board's bylaws required a unanimous vote to suspend rules.

When the board couldn't agree on what was required to suspend rules, Lawton suggested maybe the election portion of the organizational meeting should be tabled. That suggestion was dropped without comment.

"My point of order is one the election which may have been done in conflict to our bylaws," commented Ms. Borowski. "I ask the chairman to exercise his prerogative and rule on this point of order."

Gray declined, stating he couldn't make a ruling and that advice from legal coun-

sel might be needed to clarify the issue.

WHEN ASSIGNMENTS to board committees came up on the agenda, the minority of Lawton-Yack-Borowski decided to decline most committee spots.

Their strategy appeared to be to make the four officers more responsible and accountable for the actions of the coming year by leaving them with committee work as well as board offices.

During the past year, the majority of committee work was done by Ms. Borowski and Marda Benson. Ms. Borowski declined all committee assignments except as the board's representative on the Title IX (equal opportunity) Committee.

Ms. Borowski declined to serve as board representative to the Michigan Association for Improved School Legislation (MAISL). But when the board realized that MAISL bylaws allowed voting power to only the board president and vice-president, Gray and McClendon were named delegate and alternate respectively.

Yack declined to serve on the Intergovernmental Committee and continued to decline despite pressure from others to accept the assignment.

Yack said the committee was at an important juncture in its history and the board's representative shouldn't be tied to a single personality.

"Since the committee's inception, our board has been represented by Ms. Benson and myself. The way for the school board to demonstrate its support for the concept of the Intergovernmental Committee is to have another trustee agree to serve." Mrs. Tonda then agreed to assume the responsibility.

Arlen was asked to serve on the site committee but declined after asking a series of questions about the time commitment that

## Canton joins lawsuit against drain commission

Six communities including Canton Township joined hands Thursday to sue the Wayne County Drain Commissioner's office.

The suit, filed in Wayne County Circuit Court, asks for a return of money from Drain Commissioner Charles W. Young-

blood's office for work not done, and alleges, among other things, that special assessments have been improperly levied by the drain commissioner.

Canton is asking for return of some \$20,000 paid to the drain commissioner from 1973 through 1975, and for an undeter-

mined amount for drain work that was done but improperly paid for.

"The problem is that when they have these huge projects and special assessments much of the money that is special assessed against a community should come out of the county general fund," Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein said.

"The drain commissioner does some funny things and there have been a lot of improper assessments."

According to the Canton supervisor, money for administrative costs of the drain commissioner's office have been included in special assessments, rather than taken from the general fund, and the amount, apparently, is substantial.

The \$20,000 Canton is asking to have returned, Greenstein said, is for work the drain commissioner never did.

## Resident is named Detroit postmaster

Joseph J. Loukotka of Canton has been appointed Detroit postmaster and sectional center manager for 48 associate post offices in the Detroit area.

Announcement of the appointment, effective July 3, was made by Central Regional Postmaster General Clarence B. Gels.

Loukotka was director of customer services for the Detroit District. Among his responsibilities were all city and rural delivery operations at 734 post offices. In that role, he was among those instrumental in getting Canton its own zip code and postal substation.

Loukotka, who was sworn in July 2, takes over the second largest post office in the 13-state Central Region and the tenth largest in the country from the standpoint of revenue. The office employs almost 7,000 postal workers who process more than two billion pieces of mail a year.

Loukotka began his postal career in 1956 as a temporary letter carrier in Ann Arbor where he subsequently served in supervisory positions in mail processing, delivery, and collection.

He moved to the former Chicago Region headquarters in 1970 as a delivery and vehicle service examiner. He later became a delivery and collection officer before transferring to Milwaukee in 1972 when he became district director of customer services. In 1975 he took over the same assignment in Detroit.

He attended Elmhurst College, Eastern Michigan University, and Cleary College.

He succeeds William H. Schwartz who, after spending 20 days as Detroit postmaster, requested reassignment as sectional center manager-postmaster at Flint. Ralph Haftenden, Detroit District manager, had been serving as officer-in-charge of the Detroit post office in the interim.

Postmasters are selected on the basis of merit. Recommendations for postmasters in the nation's larger offices, such as Detroit, are made to the Postmaster General by a national management selection board comprised of two senior assistant postmaster generals, a representative of the U.S. Civil Service Commission, and a rep-

resentative of the business community selected by the American Arbitration Association.

# School board to decide Miller cuts tonight

A decision on which cuts will be implemented at Miller Elementary School is expected to be made at tonight's (Monday) meeting of the Plymouth Board of Education.

The school board also will discuss, and might take action, on other cuts during the meeting which begins at 7:30 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High.

Last Thursday, the administration had requested a decision be made on cuts at Miller because the school would be shut down for two weeks beginning Friday, July 2, and parents and staff would have to be notified if the school is to re-open on a shortened school day on July 19.

The board, however, voted 4-3 to defer action until July 6 with instructions for the administration to report back on legal and public relations issues involved.

**THE BOARD** is expected not to cut programs for students enrolled in Tracks C and D because they are still in the 1975-76 school year and would lose benefits other elementary pupils have had this year.

The administration is recommending that the cuts be implemented for Tracks A and B because these pupils will be starting the new school year in July and August. Track A pupils will start school again, after a five-week vacation, on July 19 and so the board must make a decision soon on whether to implement the cuts for Track A.

Trustee Tom Yack, supported by George Lawton, had made a motion to leave Miller programs intact until after the second

millage election in September.

Later in the discussion, Lawton moved to defer decision until July 6. The vote was 4-3 to defer with "no" votes cast by E.J. McClendon, Joe Gray and Flossie Tonda.

Because of the year-round schedule, Miller will be two months into its 1976-77 school year before a millage vote is taken in September. The school, with an enrollment of 900, has a faculty of 35 of whom almost six are art, music, physical education specialists who have been laid off. The administration's recommendation is to continue with plans to lay off the six specialists for Tracks A and B.

**McLENDON OBJECTED** to the board taking any action which would delay cuts until after a second millage election is held.

"I'm very uncomfortable with that. We have said to the electorate if they vote

"no" there will be certain cuts. Now we are almost saying we really didn't mean it. Our credibility as a board would be subject to serious challenge."

Yack said it was his intent to deal only with the problem of implementing cuts at Miller with its year-round schedule, and not to suggest not implementing other cuts until after the second millage election.

Vice-president Marcia Borowski asked whether media and reading support specialists would be cut from the Miller staff. She pointed out that the May 10 resolution of the board on cuts if millage failed said athletics and extracurricular activities "could" be eliminated in their entirety with some of the savings channelled to providing media and reading support specialists.

**SHIRLEY SPANIEL**, principal of Miller, said her school's staff was very honest

with parents about what would be cut if the millage were defeated. "I'd feel badly if we didn't make the cuts for Track A. The parents have been told what is coming and they expect it."

"If the millage passes in September, we will reinstate the specialists and lengthen the school day. The classroom teachers won't be affected. But the disruption would be very serious if we didn't implement the cuts now for Track A and waited instead until after the September millage election."

Yack commented that the community will be watching the board on its decisions on Miller and athletics. He added that his main concern was to implement cuts in a manner to cause the least possible disruption for children.

Lawton said the board should be more interested in not hurting young people than in protecting its credibility. "I'm much opposed to singling out Miller and football for cuts. Both Miller and football will begin the new school year before the next millage vote. If we cut Miller, I certainly hope the board will maintain its consistency when it comes to football."

Gray answered: "We have already made cuts in the athletic budget."

Trustee Richard Arlen said he would like the reading program to remain un-

touched, if not expanded, at Miller and make other cuts if necessary to protect the reading curriculum.

Once a decision is made on cuts at Miller, the central administration will mail letters to parents notifying them of the class schedules to be effective July 19.

The board voted to combine the positions of helping teacher and administrative assistant at Miller.

In other action, the board voted to give the Plymouth Jaycees permission to use a school site as an auxiliary parking lot for its carnival beginning July 8. The site is located east of Kmart at Ann Arbor Road and Haggerty. The Jaycees will stage the carnival on the Don Massey property adjacent to the school site.

## JCs get Massey site for its annual carnival

Plymouth Jaycees were wiping their brows in relief last week, as they peered at their calendars and planned their carnival, scheduled to begin just a week away.

With the annual carnival scheduled for July 8-11 and the contract for concessions, rides and arcades already given to Happy Land Shows, one nagging thought still filled the Jaycees' minds last week—where was the site for this year's festive show?

**BUT, AFTER WAITING** two months for permission to use a Plymouth Township site and failing to receive permission for two different school sites, Plymouth Jaycees finally stumbled across the perfect site last week.

Located on the south side of Ann Arbor Road between Hines Park Lincoln-Mercury and I-275, the site is owned by Don Massey, owner of Don Massey Cadillac, Inc., who has already given Jaycees his permission to use the land.

Plymouth Jaycees President Phil Soper, expected members of the Plymouth Township Board of Appeals to stamp their approval on the Jaycees' use of the site last Friday.

"We were very worried," Soper admitted. "The whole thing was almost to the

point of being embarrassing. But, as always, in a crunch, the people of this community came through. We really want to offer our thanks to Don Massey."

According to Soper, Plymouth Jaycees had hoped to obtain use of a site, located at Ann Arbor Road and Mill next to Plymouth Township Hall, for this year's annual event. But permission to use the land, owned by two different parties, did not come, despite the Jaycees two-month wait.

Their permission just wasn't coming," Soper said. Finally, about two weeks ago, I got worried and thought we really should look at alternate sites."

**BUT PLYMOUTH SCHOOL** board members turned down the Jaycees' request to use a parcel of land at the Centennial Educational Park, the site of the Jaycees' carnival last year, as well as a request to use a site at East Middle School.

School board members cited construction work at Plymouth Canton High and Little League reservations of CEP playfields as reasons for denial of the Jaycees' CEP request.

An area at East Middle School, used for the Jaycee carnival in the past, is now enclosed by fences which would create a bot-

tleneck, school board members said. One teacher at East Middle School cited problems with glass and debris after the carnival at East in years past.

Board members asked the Jaycees to inspect another school site, located between Joy and Ann Arbor Road near Haggerty, as a possible location for their carnival.

Jaycees stumbled across the Massey property, while inspecting that site, Soper said. Massey gave permission for use of the land as soon as it was requested.

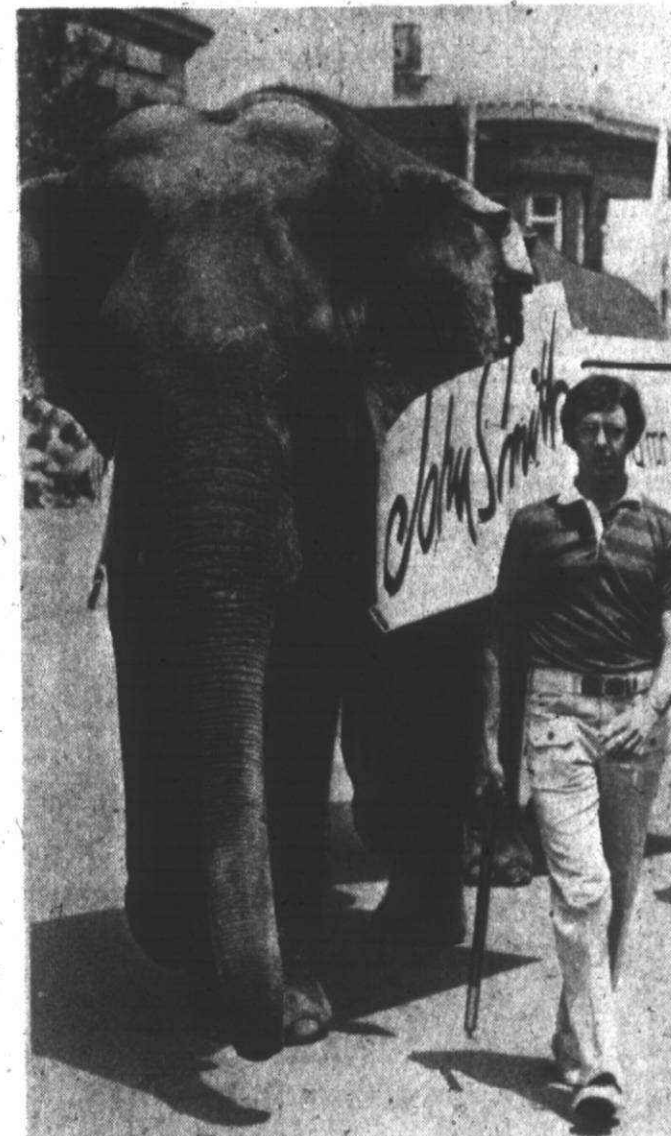

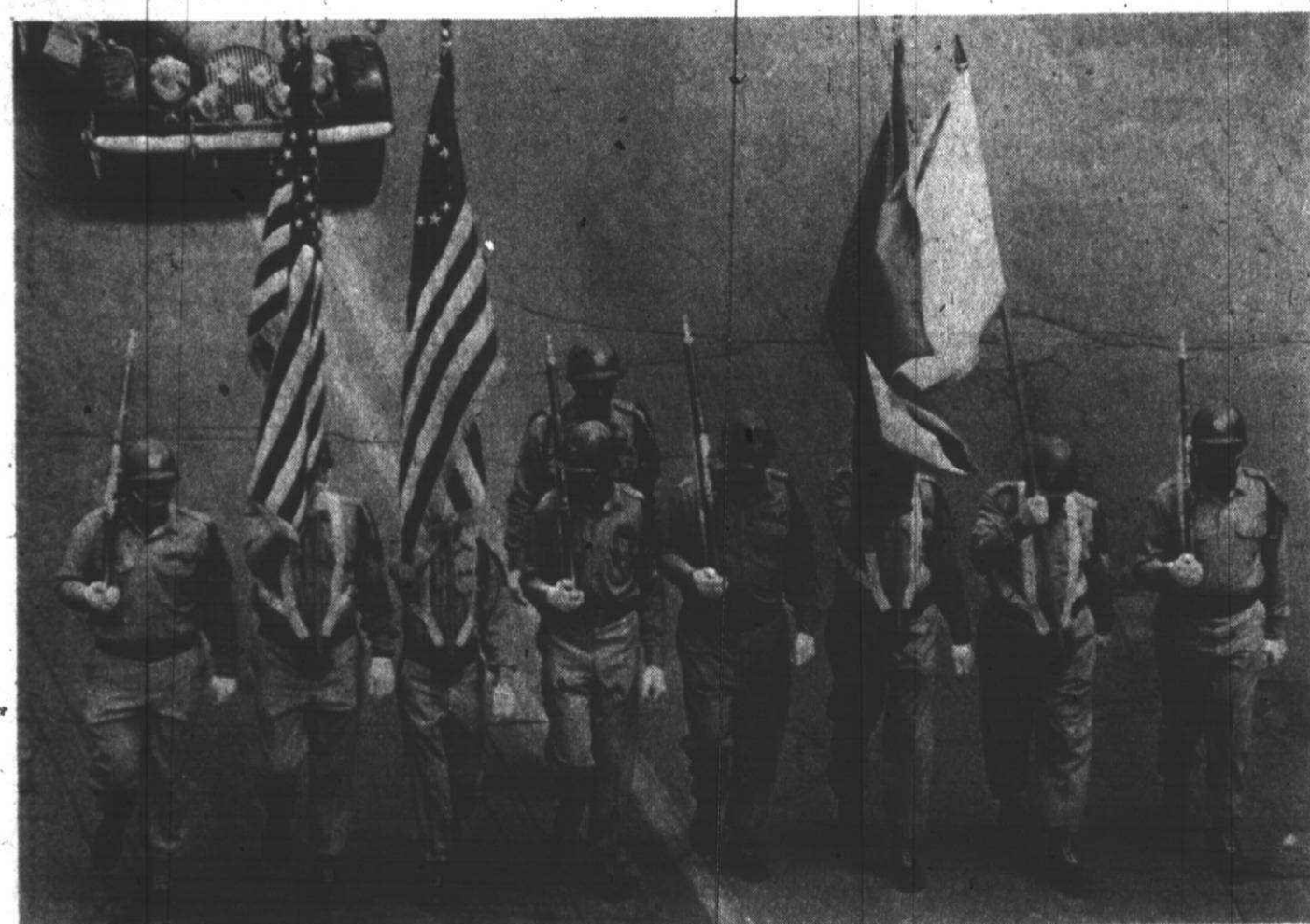

# The Stroller

## Wood mansion memories

When The Stroller looked at the smoky ruins of the legendary Gar Wood mansion on the tube the other evening he experienced the most peculiar feeling.

As he stared in almost disbelief, a chill ran up and down his spine and he had a difficult time swallowing the lump that came up in his throat.

Never before had he felt that way about the passing of a mansion but Wood's home

at Grayhaven on the Detroit River had a special attachment. It was there that The Stroller experienced some of the most interesting and exciting moments of his journalistic career.

When he looked at the tube, memories of those nights came rolling back and he well recalled an evening, back in 1932 when Gar, then the speedboat king of the world, kneeled on the costly rug and with a piece of chalk drew the design of a power plant with which he hoped to successfully defend the Harmsworth Trophy.

AT THE TIME Gar considered the British Challenge of Kaye Don the strongest he ever had received. The British challenger was coming over here with a group of Rolls-Royce engines that were considered the most powerful in the world.

To meet this challenge Gar had only what were known as Packard 750's. He had four of them, each generating about 750 horsepower. He had used a pair in each of his Miss America boats that had captured the fancy of millions along the river. But they were considered powerful enough to meet the British.

It was then that Gar got an idea and invited the members of the press and the Packard engineers to his home for dinner and what he said would be a special announcement.

Following a sumptuous dinner he guided us into the living room—the home was that large—and there unfolded the plan of hooking up the four motors in one power plant that would then generate more power than ever had been placed in a speedboat.

Memories of that evening came rolling back and The Stroller still can hear one of the engineers say, "Gar, you can't do that. You'll kill yourself."

Gar just smiled and answered, "What are you worrying about. You won't be in the boat. Orlin Johnson and I will."

On our way home the engineer pointed out that Gar was asking for trouble and that the boat would take him to eternity.

A few weeks later we were called again to the palatial mansion—this time to watch the first tryout of the new boat, the famed Miss America X.

On the motor trip out Jefferson Avenue no one in the auto spoke. As a matter of

fact each of us had written Gar's obituary before we left.

Then, standing there on the porch when the boat was towed out into the river, we stood aghast when the signal was given for a start, and the boat performed better than any previous Miss America fleet. Gar not only surprised the Packard engineer, who virtually fainted in the porch chair, but successfully defended the Harmsworth and established a world record of 124.85 miles an hour with the craft.

ON ANOTHER occasion The Stroller was having dinner with Gar when he asked if we liked organ music (The organ in his home was the best of any residence in America) and when told we did, he pushed a button and the strains of "Old Man River" filled the room.

Suddenly, the sound turned tinny and The Stroller sat startled.

"Don't worry," Gar chuckled, "in this number the Steinway piano in the next room plays the chorus."

It was in this home that The Stroller learned something on the social side, too. At all dinners Gar kept one spot next to him vacant.

When asked why, he confided that with a vacant place no one ever is embarrassed. "If some one drops in unexpectedly, we have a place for him... so we are not embarrassed and neither is he."

No wonder all these memories came back while looking at the smoldering ruins.

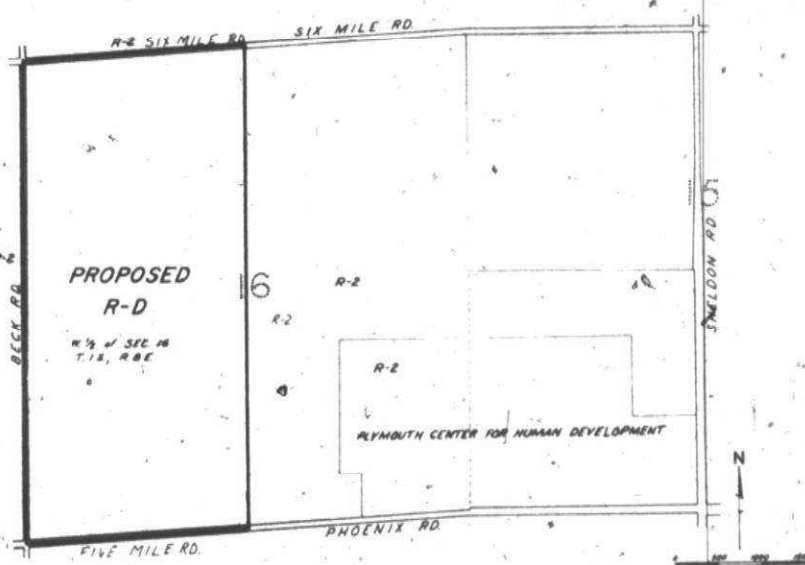

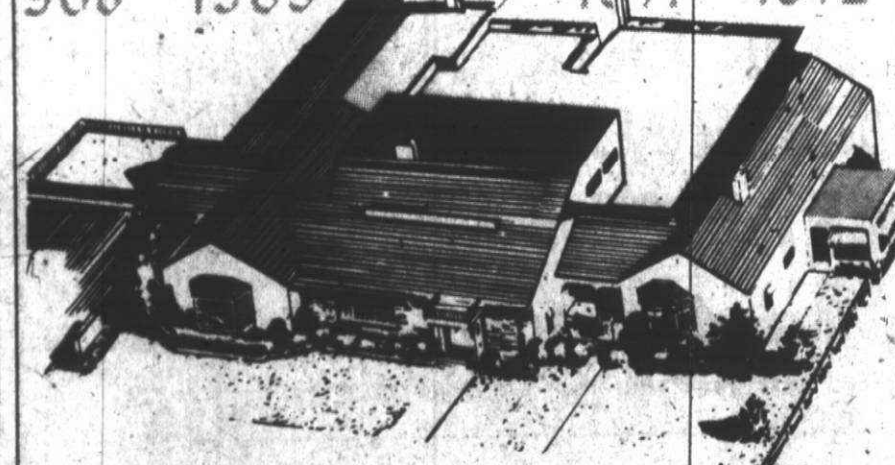

# Building up, complaints down

With the formation of a new policy by the Canton Township building department, new home complaints have fallen off, and all are being followed up better.

Complaints are down to about an average of five a week, according to building department head Charlie Thompson, and the decrease alone has allowed the depart-

ment to free up one man formerly working full time on complaints.

The complaint problem peaked about a month ago when Supervisor Robert Greenstein shut down all builders in the township for several days "to get a handle on the mushrooming complaint problem."

Since then, according to Thompson, with

the new policy, complaints have fallen off.

The procedure is simple, Thompson explained. Complaint letters received by the building department are dated and a copy of the complaint is sent to the builder immediately with a cover letter explaining that the builder has 15 days to take care of the problem.

A second letter is sent to the homeowner explaining that the builder is aware of the problem.

That letter explains to the homeowner that the builder has 15 days in which to reply to the complaint. It explains that if the builder fails to do so, the building department should be notified immediately.

When the builder responds to the homeowner, he also notifies the department of the repairs he is willing to undertake.

If there is a problem, Thompson explained, the building inspectors will arbitrate to determine the responsibility of the homeowner and the builder.

"The builders have been pretty responsive," Thompson said. "Of course if they don't respond in 15 days, we call them up and tell them no more inspections."

While total complaints are down, Thompson admits the problem will never cease. "The perfect house has never been built. There will always been complaints once a new owner gets into a house and lives there awhile."

"But overall, the situation has improved."

Thompson noted that 1976 will probably be the biggest building year for construction of single family homes in the history of Canton. Only in 1973, during the apartment construction boom, was there more work going on in the township, he said.

the other supervisors and they told me they had the same problem."

GREENSTEIN SAID he began investigating the matter and brought it to the attention of the Michigan State House Drains Committee, which held a hearing several months ago in Canton.

"It was pretty obvious it was a big rip-off," Greenstein said. "We haven't received any cooperation from the drain commissioner, so we got a lawyer and decided to sue for the return of the money."

He added, Canton made every reasonable attempt to attain some sort of amicable settlement with the drain commissioner, but all we got was the royal run-around.

"I don't feel Youngblood represents us and we won't tolerate it."

Five other communities, the cities of Ro-

mulus and Riverview, and Van Buren, Huron and Brownstown townships also were party to the suit.

Greenstein said some of those communities "were stung" a lot worse than Canton, adding that special assessments were often levied against individual property owners rather than the community.

Aside from alleging fiscal improprieties in the drain commissioner's office, the suit asks for a permanent injunction against further bills, that money currently owed to the drain commissioner be put in escrow, and that an independent accounting of the drain commissioner's office be started "to see what money was improperly attained."

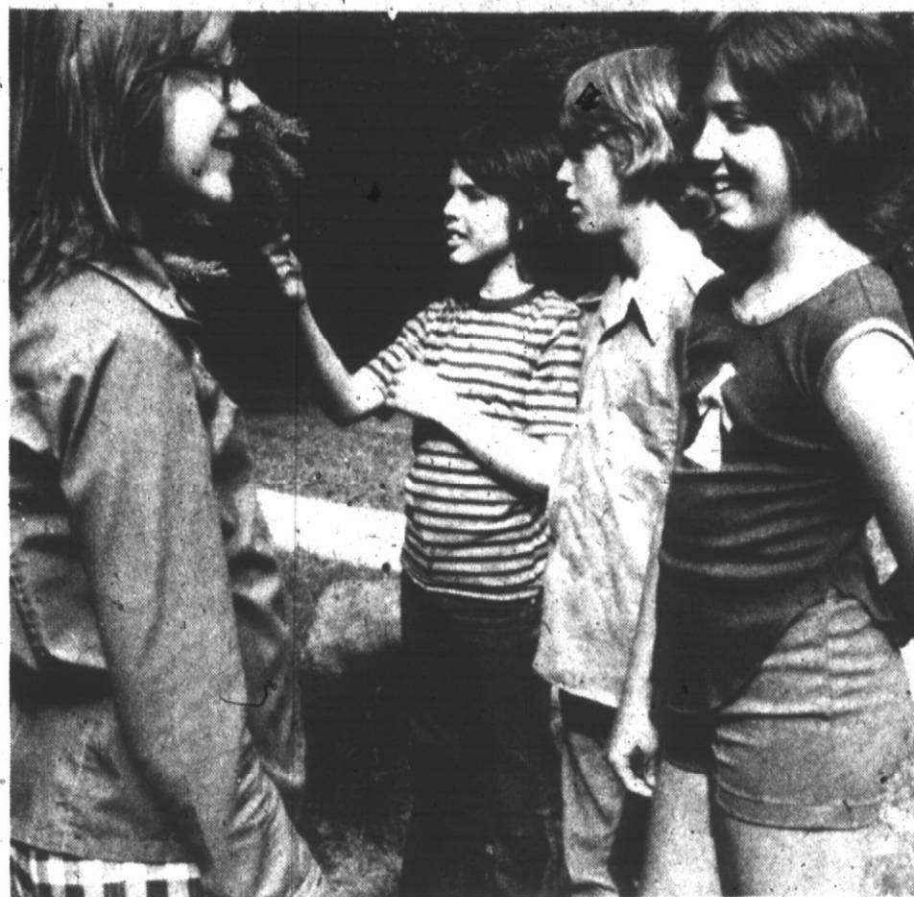
"It would be one thing if they did the work they billed us for," Greenstein said, "but they never do the work, they just come out and make inspections."

ton's reserves would soon become a full-time force of five or six of Parsell's ex-buddies from Detroit."

"Instead of the \$75,000 or whatever they're allocating for the reserves, they'll make a fulltime force—and if the citizens of Canton are going to pay for police, they might as well get their money's worth, not a bunch of 50-year old retired coppers."

Akhtar, who represents the arm of the AFL-CIO that serves police officers, said he has maintained a "friendly adversary relationship" with Parsell, former president of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM).

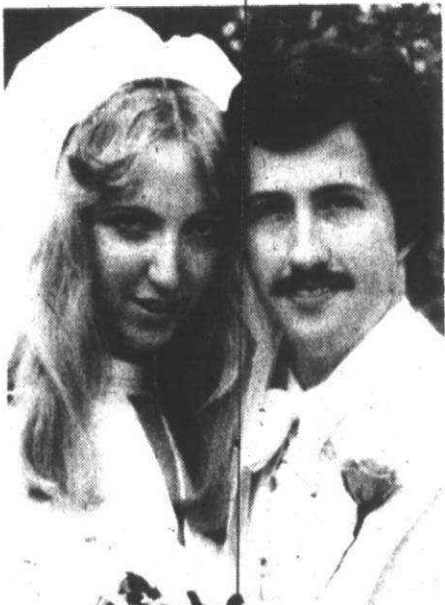

# Siding hunters: Do your homework

Tired of the expense and work of repainting your home every four or five years?

Maurice L. Richards Jr., executive vice-president of the South Oakland Board of Realtors, Inc., suggests homeowners increase the value of their homes while decreasing the amount of labor and money necessary to maintain them by covering the house's exterior with pre-painted siding that rarely, if ever, requires painting.

According to Richards, siding offers several advantages, including improvement of the home's structural soundness, adding insulation to reduce heating and cooling costs, and boosting the home's resale value.

"Before heading for the nearest siding dealer, the home owner should do some homework to insure he gets the type of siding suited to his tastes and pocketbook," Richards said in a press release issued by the board.

Since siding comes in a variety of materials and price ranges, the board has compiled a consumers guide listing the major types of siding and the advantages and disadvantages of each.

**ALUMINUM**—Siding made of aluminum is the most widely used and has been on the market for 25 years. It is durable, easy to clean, highly resistant to corrosion and is lightweight.

It also comes in a variety of panel widths, colors and textures and is priced between \$135-\$200 per 100 feet. Most manufacturers guarantee their panels against chipping, flaking and peeling for 20 years.

Critics of aluminum complain that it is easily dented and can possibly interfere with television reception.

**ASBESTOS**—A relatively inexpensive siding material costing about \$80 per 100 square feet, asbestos is available in fire-resistant sheets, shingles and clapboards. The siding can be shattered by a hard blow, is easily smudged, and should be repainted every four to six years.

**HARDBOARD**—Consisting of wood fibers permanently bonded under heat and pressure into boards or panels, hardboard is easy to work with and has become popular with do-it-yourselfers. The absence of grain in hardboard eliminates counterstresses and provides good stability. It is available in either finished or unfinished panels.

**STEEL**—Steel siding is stronger and more rigid than aluminum, but it is also

more difficult to work with. Steel siding usually comes finished with polyvinyl fluoride laminated to the metal. The finish is durable but is susceptible to rust if damaged. Steel siding ranges from \$150-\$200 per 100 square feet.

**VINYL**—Having been on the market for less than 10 years, statistics on vinyl's durability are not yet available. Unlike other sidings where the color is painted on or applied with a surface finish, the color in vinyl permeates the material. This eliminates the need for any retouching or repainting and means that surface scratches ordinarily will not show.

Vinyl can crack in cold weather and color choice is limited. Cost ranges from \$140-\$200 per 100 square feet.

**WOOD**—Despite the appearance of more durable and convenient siding materials, the versatility of wood in design and application keeps it popular with homeowners. Wood is subject to rot, termites and weather damage. However, it will not corrode, is a poor conductor of electricity, and is very easy to work with. Certain varieties, such as cedar and redwood, can be left to weather naturally. Wood siding, sold by the board foot, costs between \$300-\$650 per thousand board feet, uninstalled.

## Seat belt law should be required

A mandatory seat belt law for Michigan should be the first order of business in the next session of the legislature, according to the Traffic Association of Detroit.

The association, at its 34th annual meeting earlier this year, called for the enactment of the law as soon as possible, if not in this session, then in the next.

"The experience in Australia, the experience in European countries point out conclusively to the effectiveness of such a law," said Robert Magill, outgoing chairman of the association's board of directors. "The voluntary approach would be much too slow."

U.S. Secty. of Transportation William Coleman has estimated that 8,900 lives a year would be saved if every car occupant used his seat belt, Magill said.
