Stein slate sweeps township

A seeming coalition of differing backgrounds deposed one Democratic slate of candidates Tuesday to narrowly elect another in what some township observers labeled a relatively light turnout.

An estimated 35 per cent of the voters defeated incumbents Supervisor Robert Greenstein, Treasurer Carl Parsell, and

Trustee Jerry Cheske, replacing them with a Democratic slate of Harold Stein for supervisor, Anna Bradley for treasurer, and Gene Daley for trustee.

Independent Lynne Goldsmith was the only Democratic winner not aligned with a slate. She placed first in a closely contested race for trustee with 1,391 votes.

Only two incumbents survived the reversal and they were both unopposed—Clerk

Goldsmith wins

John Flodin and Republican Trustee Jim Poole.

Flodin, a new member of the Greenstein team, is dean of the township board with 20 years service.

Other Republicans seeking election in the November contest are George Hall for trustee, Patricia Dombecki for clerk, Bart Berg for treasurer, and Peter Bundarin, the top GOP vote-getter in the township with 340 votes, for supervisor. All Republicans ran uncontested.

THE VICTORY FOR Stein's team, al-

though new to township politics, came as little surprise to Greenstein, who had maintained that a small turnout would be his death knell.

While Stein cited a strong grass roots effort as the determining factor in his victory, others were quick to note the very heavy Republican crossover vote. Democratic ballots outnumbered Republican ballots by a 5-1 margin.

Some interpreted the results as a strong anti-Greenstein statement rather than a positive vote for Stein.

It was a last-stand effort for the farm interests of Canton, as the southwest quadrant of the township went heavily for Stein offsetting Greenstein's margin in precinct seven, a subdivision stronghold.

Precinct two, which covers the entire southwest quarter of the township went 2-1 for Stein. Those voters would be most affected by Greenstein's land use plan, and farmers have publicly challenged the supervisor over his failure to guarantee them equity for their lands.

Stein, who outpolled Greenstein 1,725-1,593, was quiet and confident in victory. Sitting in the corner of his basement in a small office while hordes of well wishers and campaign workers celebrated, Stein

said the victory was the result of hard work.

"IT WAS A door-to-door campaign and we relied on personal contact. The true winners of this election are citizens of Canton both east and west of Canton Center."

Looking haggard, and still not fully recovered from a knee operation several months ago, Stein said he was not surprised by his victory even though this is his first attempt at political office.

"Actually," he said, "I expected to win by a bigger margin."

Parsell, who was nudged by Stein's running mate Bradley by an equally slim mar-

Greenstein calm in defeat

Land plan, reserves in doubt

Alternately biting, then gracious but calm throughout in defeat, Supervisor Robert Greenstein didn't let on to any personal hurt caused by his rejection at the polls Tuesday.

Speaking quietly of the accomplishments of his short-lived tenure as Canton's chief administrator, Greenstein did not act surprised by the primary results.

"It's been my pleasure serving you," he said, as he talked to supporters in the Plymouth-Canton High School cafeteria.

"I am extremely proud of what we have accomplished. We did it with honor and we have conducted ourselves with honor throughout."

Defeated narrowly Tuesday by Democratic challenger Harold Stein, a virtual unknown at the start of the campaign months ago, Greenstein said he was not bitter at all about the outcome of the election.

"The people that voted have spoken and those that stayed home will have to live with that choice as well."

Referring to Stein's victory he commented, "You have to admire a lion that attacks you in your own forest. They played by their rules, we played by ours."

Turning philosophical he added, "I was under the mistaken impression that if you gave all you had and you had accomplishments to show for it, the people would show their appreciation."

WHILE GREENSTEIN'S defeat casts his personal future in doubt, it leaves many more questions as to the future of Canton Township.

The reserves, the sign ordinance, and more important, the controversial land use plan are now smothered with question marks.

"After we won the primary, the previous administration ceased working on their master land use plan. I suspect the board will now because of the election await the November election before it acts further on the plan."

"The remaining candidates intend to throw out the plan and develop the entire township."

The supervisor pledged, however, to continue implementing the reserve police program. "I still fully support the program and the people in it. It is my belief they will prove themselves by November."

If elected, Stein said he would order a complete restudy of the master land use plan—"one that will be fair and equitable to all. We'll do it in a democratic fashion, and the voice of the people will be heard," he said.

He added that the reserves might be implemented under his leadership. If so, they would be returned to their original intent. "They would be the eyes and ears of the official law enforcement agencies, and they would not be armed," Stein said.

The sign and berm ordinance, he said, would also be restudied, and a compromise would be attempted.

GREENSTEIN SAID he would not endorse any of the candidates left in the field, either Democratic or Republican, and added he would not attempt a write-in campaign.

But he did not rule out the possibility.

"That's up to the people. I will not actively seek a write-in on the November ballot," he said.

Waxing critical, he added, "I don't think anyone is worthwhile of support. To me, either way you go it's an utter tragedy for the township."

"This is not a case of sour grapes," he emphasized, "I know the other candidates

and I don't think they are worthy of election."

Greenstein said he will not seek to regain office in the future. "I'm thinking seriously of opening a law practice in Canton. I have the strong feeling that the services of a good lawyer are going to be greatly needed because of the outcome of this election," he said.

Circuit court expansion applauded

A pilot program calling for some circuit court functions to be performed outcounty in the fall has already brought rave reviews from at least two police agencies covering the Plymouth-Canton communities.

Inspector Robert Sullivan of the Wayne County Sheriff's Road Patrol hailed the pilot project as a "real savings" and said he expected it would allow his men "much more time on the street."

"I think this move is going to save a lot of tax dollars," Sullivan said. "We won't have to go downtown for everything and it should prove a great saving of time for each man."

The pilot program, which received \$95,000 in federal grants and \$5,000 more each from the state and county will allow establishment of four or five satellite circuit courts in various outcounty locations yet to be determined.

Four or five district or municipal judges will serve as acting circuit judges on a rotating basis, according to Chief Circuit Court Judge James Canham.

THE SATELLITE courts will conduct felony criminal arraignments, pretrial plea bargaining, and plea taking in or near the community a crime occurred.

Three district court judges serving on a study committee to improve outcounty circuit court services have already been selected by Canham. They are James B. Stone, 34th District Court in Romulus, James Mies, 16th District Court in Livonia, and Jerry McNally, 33rd District Court in Trenton.

Those judges, however, won't serve in the communities where they preside over their district courts.

Sullivan said he often has men tied up in court proceedings for one or two days. "There's no question it will be a great saving," he said. "We can have a man in court, and then out in his own bailiwick in a matter of minutes."

"Now you have to drive downtown, look for a place to park, pay for it, and then sit around waiting. Sometimes the same man has to go back the next day."

"I think it's one heck of an innovation."

LT. WILLIAM TOMCZYK, commander of the Plymouth State Police subpost, was equally pleased with the decision to try the new system.

"Anytime you can handle it locally instead of downtown Detroit, you're saving time and money."

Tomczyk said the post had worked out a system where one detective instead of various troopers handle the pretrial work, but he said the move to set up the outcounty

facilities would free up the detective for investigation of complaints.

David Kasunic, administrator of the outcounty project, scheduled to last 15 months, said he hoped the program would be in full swing by October.

He said the first three months of the program would be devoted to "gearing up."

County commissioner Royce Smith said the program would be a first for outcounty communities and save "precious hours" for suburban police officers.

Investigation of arson continues

A lack of clues have stymied Wayne County Sheriff's investigating two apparent arson attempts at Deer Creek apartment complex.

The fires, one early July 24, and one early the following day, did little damage, the sheriff's spokesman said, but residents were forced out of their apartments for the day.

The fires, which occurred in phase II of the complex, located on the south side of Joy Road east of I-275, were "obviously arson," Detective David Hargreaves said. "We have an ongoing investigation, but there's not a whole lot to go on. There's no doubt it was arson. The fires were certainly not self-igniting," he said.

Hargreaves said several names of possible suspects have been submitted to him, but none of them have resulted in a break in the case.

The first fire, reported to the Canton fire department at 12:12 a.m. was set in the basement and first floor of the 16-unit building. The second, on morning was set in the basement.

A spokesman for Schostak Brothers, the management firm of the complex, said damage was minimal from both fires.

One rough estimate put property damage at about \$600.

Greg Rose, resident manager of the building, said most damage occurred as a result of the smoke.

Mei Paulun, Canton fire chief, ordered residents of the complex out of apartments because of possible wiring damage.

"It was a fairly large fire in the basement, and we didn't know if there would be shorts in the wiring, so we advised that the building be evacuated," he said.

Rose said six units of the building were occupied at the time of the first blaze.

He said it was the first incident of that nature at the apartment complex and that security measures have been increased.

"I don't know why it happened, but everything's back to normal again," he said.

Sheriff's officers refused to speculate on the reason for the arson attempts.

Pursell, Pierce will square off

Plymouth's Carl Pursell easily won the Republican nomination for the 2d Congressional District Tuesday and will face Democrat Ed Pierce of Ann Arbor in the Nov. 2 election.

Pursell, in the state senate for nearly six years, defeated Ron Trowbridge, Ann Arbor city councilman, by a 64-36 margin, piling up large margins as expected in Livonia, Plymouth city and township and Northville city and township and holding Trowbridge to a narrow margin of votes in Washtenaw County.

Pursell, 43, easily captured the city of Plymouth with 89.6 per cent of the vote—630-73.

In Livonia, the senator received 79½ per cent of the vote, or a margin of 3,550-907.

Pierce, an Ann Arbor doctor who runs a medical center for low-income families, easily beat four opponents, including Marvin Stempien, Livonia attorney, who finished second. The others were Delbert Hoff-

man of Monroe, Mary Robek of Ypsilanti, and John Spillon of Monroe.

STEMPIEN DID well as expected in Wayne County but didn't get the 3-1 margin or better he needed to offset Pierce's large plurality in Washtenaw County.

Pursell, interviewed in his home after most of the election returns were in, told about how he will campaign for the congressional seat in the next three months.

"It will be an excellent campaign," he said, "with Pierce's liberalism vs. my moderation. It will be similar to the (U.S. Senate) race of Don Riegle and Marvin Esch.

Pursell said the primary results show he has a broad-based support with a strong Ann Arbor following.

"This is a great opportunity to win the congressional seat," he added. "I feel the independents would lean toward me." Pur-

sell said in stressing his moderate position.

The senator said that his goal in the primary was to turn out a large vote in his senate district, which includes Livonia, Plymouth and Northville; and concentrate heavily and get acquainted with voters in the other portions of the congressional district in Monroe and Washtenaw Counties.

Pursell said he felt he did "extremely well" in Washtenaw, where Trowbridge was expected to be strong.

"I was shooting for 30 per cent, thought

I would do well to get 35 per cent, and was delighted to get 40 per cent in Ann Arbor."

Pierce credited his strong primary showing to the strong organization he built with the help of hundreds of "hard working volunteers."

The doctor, who lost the party's nomination to John Reuther by only 81 votes in 1974, said that his supporters are people who are politically active in primary elections and who like his ideology.

"Those people are issues-orientated people," he said.

He said that a candidate must have an organizational base to win.

Pierce admitted that he was disappointed in not getting more votes in the Wayne County portion of the congressional district.

Looking forward to the fall general election, Pierce said that he will "talk to anybody and will try and meet as many people as possible."

Brown repels Walker challenge

In the 37th State House District, incumbent Thomas Brown (D-Westland), whose district also includes Canton and Plymouth townships, won the Democratic primary by nearly a 2-1 margin over Brian Lewis Walker.

Voting in Canton was marked by a heavy crossover of Republicans to Democrats. No crossover was reported in either Plymouth Township, a heavily Republican area, or in Westland, primarily a Democratic area.

Votes cast for Brown by city were: West-

land, 1,893; Canton, 1,526; and Plymouth Township, 142. Total votes for Brown were 3,561.

Votes cast for Walker by city were: Westland, 795; Canton, 1,036; and Plymouth Township, 102. Total votes were 1,933.

Both Brown and Walker are Westland residents.

Republican Brian Kidston, a Plymouth resident, was unopposed in the 37th District primary. Total votes cast for him were 893. Votes cast by city were: Westland, 368; Canton, 309; and Plymouth Township, 216.

In the 38th State House District, which includes Westland and Livonia, incumbent John Markes (D-Livonia) and Republican Robert C. Law were unopposed in the primary. They will face each other in the November general election.

Markes received 1,804 votes in Westland and 1,528 in Livonia for a total of 3,332. Law received 411 votes in Westland and 1,036 in Livonia for a total of 1,447.

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Plans to study Edison corridor suggested

A committee of Canton residents soon could study the potential benefits and problems created by a proposed recreational area beneath Detroit Edison power lines and come to grips with some residents' fears over use of the corridor for recreational purposes.

Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein is expected to broach a suggestion of trustee candidate Joyce Willis to establish the committee at Tuesday's township board meeting.

If Ms. Willis' suggestion is adopted, a committee of residents for and against the recreational area will study the proposed construction of bicycle and horse paths beneath Detroit Edison's high tension wires and present their arguments for and against the proposal to the township's recreation committee.

IN TURN, recreation committee members will submit a recommendation on the matter to township officials.

Detroit Edison officials have already approved the concept of leasing their nine-mile, T-shaped strip of power lines to the township for recreational purposes. According to a lease proposed by the utility company, the township would pay rent equal to the cost of insurance on the land.

But, because of some residents' concerns, township officials have not attempted to negotiate a lease with Detroit Edison, despite the company's approval of the concept last spring.

Some residents of property abutting the corridor fear the construction of bicycle or horse paths would endanger their property and result in vandalism and litter. Use of the corridor for recreational purposes

would destroy the privacy around their homes, some residents contend, while others question the safety of activity beneath the high tension wires.

RESIDENTS of land abutting the Edison corridor would serve on the proposed committee, according to Ms. Willis' suggestion, and present their arguments to recreation committee members.

Residents of other township areas who

favor recreational use of the corridor would also serve on the proposed committee and present their feelings on the matter.

Township board officials would take action on the matter, Greenstein said, after reviewing the recreation committee's recommendation.

"We don't want to do anything until we look at residents' complaints," he said.

Anyone who casually dropped in at Canton's King Custard for an ice cream cone Friday night was greeted with a surprise.

The ice cream parlor was packed to capacity with hordes of toddlers, elementary-school kids, teenagers and adults patiently wiling the hour's wait in line with friendly jokes, chit-chat and play.

But, to the casual passer-by, it was not the crowd or the wait that brought the biggest surprise.

It was the pajamas!

There were kids in pajamas, parents in pajamas and grandparents in pajamas. Even Stan Hammerstein, owner of the ice cream parlor at Harvard Square Shopping Center, filled cones and sundae dishes in his sleepwear.

Friday was "pajama party" night at King Custard, and anyone dressed in pajamas could purchase ice cream at half the usual price.

The party brought an estimated 1,500 customers to the shop during a three-hour period, according to Hammerstein, and practically everyone was dressed in pajamas.

"It was about three times the success I thought it would be," said a happy Hammerstein after the party was over. "It was a lot of fun. We all had a great time."

"WE HAD individuals in their 50's and

60's in pajamas who loved every second of it," added the jubilant store owner. "We had people in off the streets who were totally unaware of it, who didn't turn around and walk out."

"To wait in line 45 minutes to an hour and not complain, people must have had fun."

Hammerstein conceived the pajama party concept to add "a little novelty" to his business. Despite fears that "no one would come" to his party, the store owner luckily ordered extra ice cream, cones and sundae toppings for the festive event.

Five minutes before the party was scheduled to begin, Hammerstein changed his street clothes for pajamas. But waitress Young Ran Cho of Canton and Mary Farion never got the chance because of the customers who jammed the store.

"Two of my friends just happened to be here," Hammerstein recalled with a chuckle. "The crowds were so heavy, I grabbed them and put them to work."

Hundreds of ice cream cones and sundaes later, Hammerstein looked at his depleted stock and remembered the success of his party.

"We had all kinds of comments—from this guy's got to be crazy, to this is a great idea," Hammerstein recalled. "We had a lot of people asking us if we'd have another one, and I think we will."

"It was just like one great big pajama party!"

gin, 1,641 to 1,549, appeared philosophical in defeat.

Telling supporters who had gathered with all of the Greenstein slate at the Plymouth-Canton High School cafeteria, that "the people had spoken," he said he would not seek a write-in campaign in November.

"I urge you to vote for the candidates that are left. Two years ago we ran offering to turn the township around. We thought we had accomplished a great deal and done what the people wanted. But it appears now they want another change."

"I thank all of you for your help and support."

CHESKE, WHO RAN third behind Goldsmith and Daley with 1,559 votes, echoed Parselland Greenstein. "I knew we were in trouble when there was a small turnout. I don't know why the people voted as they did, but it's over for us now. It's time to look to other people."

Joyce Willis, the fifth member of Greenstein's slate finished a strong fourth in the five person race for two trustee positions with 1,206, 124 shy of second place finisher Gene Daley who tallied 1,330 votes. Noel Culbert was fifth with 382 votes.

Overall, Stein carried five of nine precincts, winning big in the second and third precincts with slightly smaller margins in the fourth and fifth precincts. Stein also

carried the absentee votes by a 3-2 margin.

Greenstein was a big winner in the first and seventh precincts and edged Stein in the sixth by three votes. But he was unable to carry his home precinct, number eight, losing to Stein there by an 18-vote margin.

While Greenstein has received a great deal of criticism in the past year and half over his block of four votes and the "slate," voters didn't seem to abandon the slate concept.

Where Stein did well, so did his running mates. Only in the fourth precinct did voters seem to thoroughly delineate between members of the two slates—and there they gave the biggest vote to inde-

pendent Lynne Goldsmith.

For Greenstein, it was as he had said he hoped it would be—a sink or swim proposition for the slate.

Flodin was the biggest vote getter, pulling down 2,262 votes!

In the race to fill four constable spots, incumbent Timothy Murphy outpolled the field of 11 Democratic candidates, collecting 719 votes. He was followed by his wife Irene with 705 votes, Robert Edwards with 699 votes and incumbent Ann Blevis with 697 votes. Deposed incumbents Gene Reeves and Jack Blevis polled 683 and 605 votes respectively.

No Republicans entered the race for constable.

Other local skaters include top fund raiser, Darlene Holt of Garden City who skated for \$61 an hour, raising over \$1,200. Her brothers Dave and Dale contributed their band music to keep skaters' spirits up during the curves and long straight-aways.

Larry White of Redford Township raised \$666. Sandra Hall of Plymouth brought in \$200 and Toni Bronokowski of Plymouth raised about \$150.

Diane Tarbet of Livonia and her daughters, Tammy and Linda participated in the skateathon and agreed that it was fun as well as worthwhile.

"All the kids had a great time," said Mrs. Tarbet, a skater for 25 years. "They were all tired, but the pop and hot dogs provided energy and incentives to keep on skating. They were determined to finish their 20 hours."

came to the conclusion they now were determined to log 20 hours of sleep, their 20 hours of sleep.

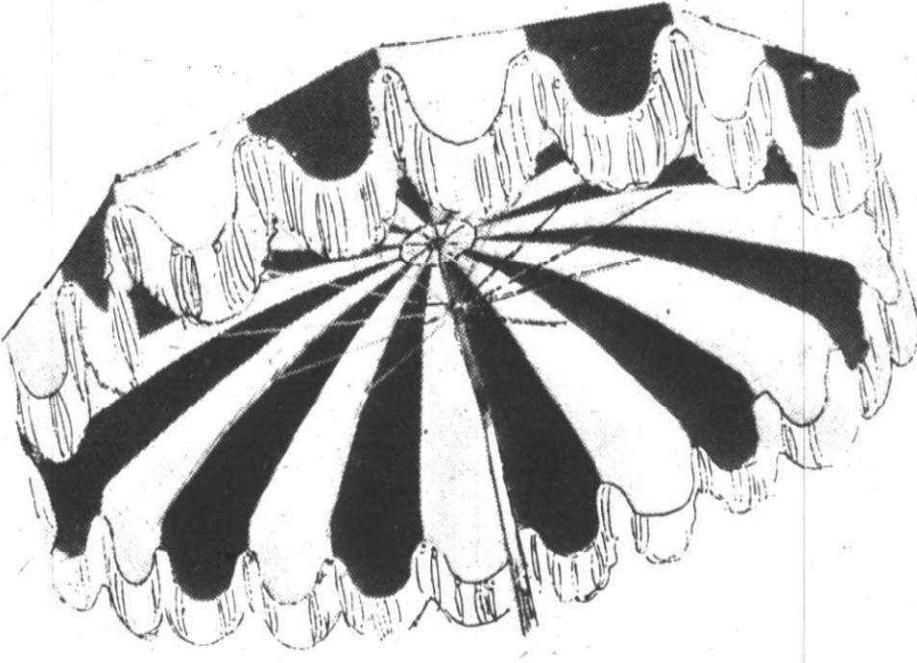
"That's probably what they're all doing," said Mrs. Tarbet, "and I can't say I blame them."

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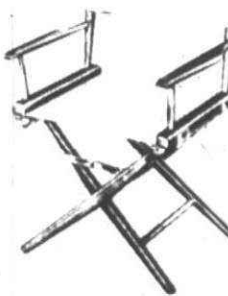


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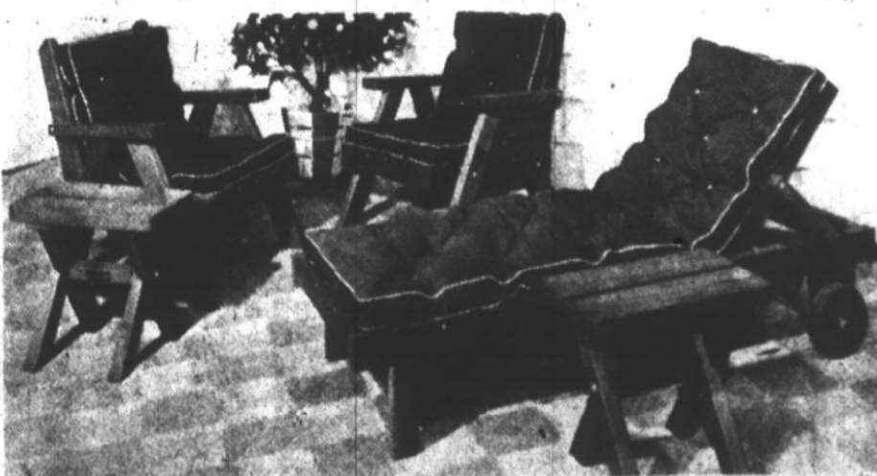
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Evans closing recalls founder

(First of three-part series)

The announcement in May that Evans Products Company was closing its plant on Eckles Road in Plymouth Township brings to mind the colorful individual who founded the company, and moved its headquarters plant from Detroit to Plymouth just after World War II.

He was a Virginian named Edward Step-toe Evans. One of the best-known businessmen in Michigan prior to his death in September, 1945, he arrived in Detroit from the south in 1915.

He began his rise to industrial success by selling soft pine blocks to the infant automobile industry which used them to brace the wheels of autos shipped in freight cars.

Evans was nearly broke and had to get around on crutches because of leg trouble when first arrived in Michigan. He died a self-made millionaire, attributing his fortune to a decision reached the day he called on the old King Motor Car Company to make his first sale.

That was the day he decided to learn more about loading automobiles in freight cars than any man living.

IN 1918, Evans hired a railroad yard engine, three freight cars, several old automobiles, an operating crew, and a stretch of railroad track. He instructed the crew to bang the engine into the cars until he told them to stop.

He varied the loading conditions, the speed of impact, and other factors which cause automobiles to shift in freight cars. By the time he was done, Evans had the first calibration ever made of impacts and the damage they do to autos in transit.

With that knowledge, he was able to sell "loading engineering" with a zealous conviction born of actual experience.

The practical side of this tall, handsome, distinguished industrialist apparent in a brief look at his achievements in business. During the 1920's, he was either president, director, or financial backer of more than 20 business enterprises.

He became president of five airplane companies, one of which was the first to put brakes on airplanes. Another installed the first retractable landing gear. For most of the middle 1920's, Evans' personal earnings were reported to be more than \$1 million a year.

In 1919, he founded the E.S. Evans & Company, later renamed Evans Products Company. The firm's first offices were in the old Dime Bank building near city hall in Detroit.

The plant was on Fullerton Avenue. In the 1920's, as the company's president, chief inventor, and supersalesman, Evans showed the auto companies how to ship four autos instead of the usual two, in a freight car.

He designed wooden boxes for exporting automobiles that doubled the safety, yet used 50 per cent less lumber.

Lost collie needs shots

Honey Bear, a small yellow collie with no tail, was hit by a car last Friday near the Clark station at the corner of Ford and Sheldon roads in Canton Township.

She had been riding in a van with her owner and was not missed until the van neared Saginaw.

IN THE LATE twenties, he entered the battery separator field, acquiring a plant at Coos Bay, Oregon. His company soon became the top producer in that industry.

In the 1930's, with the help of a retired architect, Samuel Butterworth, Evans invented the "auto loader," a tubular steel mechanism installed in the roofs of freight cars. The automobile manufacturers loved it. The device cut damage to autos in transit from \$5 to nine cents a car and saved 90 per cent of loading and unloading costs.

In the late thirties, Evans began making automotive heaters, soon becoming number one supplier of truck heaters to the independent truck manufacturers.

During the forties, Evans developed the "utility loader," used by the U.S. Army and Navy during World War II to carry loads ranging from biscuits to bombs. The U.S. Naval Ordinance equipped its freight cars with the device to handle ammunition and explosives. It cut the time of loading shells at federal arsenals by 25 per cent.

During World War II, Evans machine gun mounts helped the U.S. and British war effort. Evans tank heaters, flown to Leningrad, helped the Russians stem the final German attack when the German tanks stalled in the cold.

Evans ambulance planes with removal stretchers, the first of their kind, caught the attention of General Douglas MacArthur who ordered the first completed plane to hurry the wounded out of the Philippines.

ALSO IN THE forties, Evans broke into the plywood manufacturing field on the west coast. He constructed a plant at Lebanon, Oregon. For many years it was the largest plywood plant in the world.

Evans' humble beginnings taught him the value of a dollar, as his twin sons, Edward and Robert (who ran the company on in Plymouth after his father died) had reason to know.

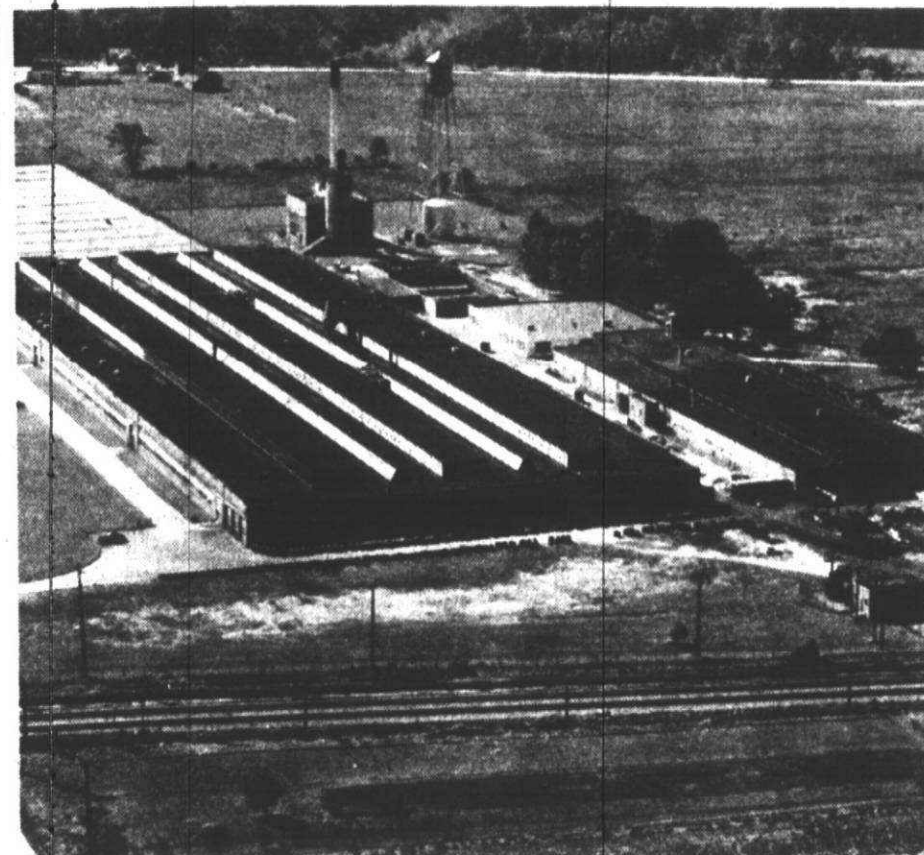
On one occasion, while they were studying at the University of Lausanne in Switzerland, they cabled their father that foreign study was a waste of time and money. They wanted to return home.

His reply read, "Stay. Waste all the time you want, but don't waste money."

Although he abhorred waste, whether it was of money or of natural resources, Evans, a master salesman, knew the value of appearances.

In 1924, as soon as he could afford it, he moved from a \$10,000 house in Detroit to a \$225,000 mansion in Grosse Pointe. He joined the best clubs in Detroit, New York, Chicago, and Richmond, Virginia, where he was born.

Crespi: A handball king

What started as an exercise program eight years ago for a slightly overweight Ken Crespi has enabled the Livonian to become the best male singles handball player in the state.

Crespi, a credit manager with Huck Corp., has captured the championship trophies the last two years in both the Michigan Handball Association and the Metro Open Tournaments.

Playing handball on the average of four times per week, mostly at the Livonia YMCA, Crespi doesn't have to worry about his weight or getting the proper exercise any more.

"Handball just intrigued me," said the tall, lean Crespi, recalling his early days attempting to master the sport. "It was a challenge at the time."

Even now, many matches and hours later, Crespi's enthusiasm remains high. "Handball enables a person to get his exercise and compete at the same time."

Handball, as many of the dwindling number of players will likely tell you, is much more grueling and harder on the muscles than racquetball and tennis.

For openers, a handball player does not have the advantage of a racquet to return the hard rubber ball. The hand is the racquet and hence the derivation of the sport.

Crespi said it took him two or three years of consistent practice to become proficient with both hands and six years to use both sides of his body proficiently.

In the beginning stages, though, it is not uncommon for a novice to spend a considerable amount of time soaking swollen hands in hot water and epsom salts.

Add to the hand difficulties, the tensing of muscles due to sudden starts and stops at full running speed, a continuous assault on balance and the reflexes, one quickly realizes that tournament competition is basically a younger person's arena.

Crespi, who has gone through the pain and now approaching his late 30s, concedes that his years in tournament play may be numbered. "At about age 40, there is a gradual decline of the reflexes," the Livonia champion said.

Crespi added that it is not uncommon for

a handball player to lose 10-12 pounds during a tough weekend tournament. In spite of its drawbacks, Crespi still loves the sport. And, any game is easier to enjoy when one has developed its basic skills.

Crespi, as his string of championships might lead one to believe, has mastered the three basic handball shots.

"The lob is when you arch the ball toward the ceiling, the pass is a return off any of the walls and the kill is a low shot off the front wall inches above the floor," explained Crespi.

What is his favorite shot? "The kill," champion Crespi softly responded with a slight smile on his lips.

Crespi, who most recently teamed with Larry Brown of Mount Clemens to take the doubles crown in the Mount Clemens Knights of Columbus Tournament, says handball may be a dying sport.

"The hands don't swell if you play racquetball or paddleball," Crespi commented.

The Livonian credits his employer for giving him time off to compete in major tournaments. Even his colleagues get into the act by placing newspaper clippings of his exploits on the bulletin board at work.

What lies ahead for the current champion, who lives with his wife, Barbara, and three children in the north-central part of town?

Even when his tournament days are over, one just has to believe Crespi will be able to be found-on the average of four times per week at the Livonia Y-bouncing a ball off the wall with his regular playing partners.

ALTHOUGH BOWLING is the second oldest sport known to man, being ante-dated only by archery, seldom does a season go

by without some new twist. This time, it is a bold step being taken by the American Bowling Congress to fight the "blocking" of lanes, the "soft shell" balls and all other problems concerned with the maintenance of the lanes.

The ABC is having eight lanes installed at its headquarters office in Greendale, Wis., for the sole purpose of doing its own testing of all equipment.

In other years, this work was done in the commercial houses with the co-operation of the proprietor. While it worked well, there were times when the work held up the league play during the regular season and all hands were disgruntled.

It is to end this type of problem that the ABC, in co-operation with the Women's International Bowling Congress, is having the eight lanes constructed.

It marks the first time any such program has been initiated in any sport. CORRECTION In this space last edition it was reported that the new 40-lanes establishment in Canton Center, was to be known as Superior Bowl. This was just

three letters too many. The name of the establishment will be The Super Bowl and will be open for the fall league season.

ONE OF THE finest showings of the entire year is that of Mary Mohacsi, the Livonia school teacher, and a former bowling "queen" in the metropolitan area.

Bowling against the hand picked all-stars in the proprietors mixed league this summer, Mary is averaging 194 and heads the list of the ladies. She has set the pace during the entire summer.

On the men's side, it is Rocky Graziani with an average of 211.

For the first nine weeks, the league averaged 189, while bowling in a different house each week. The women have averaged 180.1 and the men 197.8.

With those figures it is one of the strongest leagues in the entire Midwest.

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Biological services report available

One of the nation's most innovative programs aimed at protecting fish and wildlife and their habitats, while allowing for accelerated land and water development projects, has issued its first report, Director Lynn A. Greenwalt of the Interior Department's U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced.

The report, the first of the agency's new Biological Services program, provides an excellent overview of the possible environmental implications associated with energy development and also summarizes various research projects that were begun last year.

"Our primary purpose," Greenwalt said, "is to collect scientific information on national fish and wildlife resources and their habitats and make it available to decisionmakers at all levels of government. This information is essential if they are to accurately anticipate and minimize problems related to major land and water changes. It is precisely because this kind of ecological expertise was not available in the past that decisions were made which resulted in the permanent destruction of prime habitat and unnecessary degradation of the environment."

The program attempts to narrow the traditional conflicts between "progress vs. environment" controversy. It does this by first identifying critical areas which would experience severe impact, then describing those options and alternatives which would be least harmful, and finally by recommending safeguards and stipulations necessary to protect fish and wildlife resources.

In its first year, the program focused major attention on the environmental implications of the nation's accelerating energy development. Over 40 projects were initiated in the areas of coal extraction and processing, oil shale and geothermal energy development, powerplants, and Outer Continental Shelf oil and gas development.

At the same time, a significant effort was devoted to more traditional land and water development issues: stream alteration, coastal ecosystems, western water allocation, and an inventory of the nation's wetlands.

Another study begun, and one of particular concern, is the identification of biological indicators, such as herons and other wading birds in coastal zones, which could alert scientists to a changing ecology before its effects have reached gross proportion or irreparable damage.

Since the goal of the program is to provide scientific information on which to recognize and weigh ecological alternatives, a substantial effort was also made to contact potential users of this information and make it easily available to them.

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Look for meteor spectacular

Although summer won't officially be over until Sept. 22, with August here, it seems like the season is almost over. But, there's at least a month of camping, picnicking and stargazing left before the early bedtimes of the school year. And, Au-

gust night skies will provide one of the strongest meteor showers of the year.

The Perseids meteor shower will reach its peak Aug. 11. Up to 50 meteors per hour have been spotted from this shower, but fewer will probably be seen this month because the moon will still be very bright on the 11th. It's best to watch for the Perseids with the naked eye after midnight and away from city lights.

As for the planets, although Mars has been daily in the news, it is not so accommodating to skygazers. But, although it is fairly close to the sun, it can still be found

using binoculars to the upper left of Venus.

VENUS, IF YOU carefully scan the western horizon just after sunset, has just returned to the evening sky. Often referred to as the "evening" or "morning star," depending on when it is seen, Venus is actually a planet about the size of earth. It shines by reflected sunlight.

Lower than Mars but more difficult to see is the planet Mercury. Jupiter, the largest planet of our solar system, can easily be seen in the eastern morning sky, just south of the famous star cluster called the Pleiades, or the Seven Sisters.

And, during the last half of August, the ringed planet Saturn will return to the morning sky, rising just before the sun.

AS FOR summer constellations, they still dominate the evening sky in August, but a few of the autumn groups are creeping up over the eastern horizon.

Canton ballot results have wide implications

Just as the defeat of Marda Benson a month ago caught many political observers of the Plymouth-Canton community by surprise, so does the defeat of Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein in Tuesday's primary.

Once viewed as a shoe-in, Greenstein was leveled by a low key man named Harold Stein who came out of nowhere to reduce the supervisor's ambitions and plans to nothing more than mere dreams.

But while the election in no uncertain terms drastically alters the course of Canton (for better or for worse), it has a wider impact.

Canton, attempting to come to grips with the tremendous growth pressures it has faced in the last half decade, will again undergo a change of direction in planning.

Stein, who really has said little concrete in terms of land planning, seems to believe that Canton's growth will be controlled by a lack of sewer capacity.

If he wins in November, and after Tuesday's stunning victory he's hard to bet against, he will order a complete restudy of Canton plans.

What that means is anybody's guess.

His opponent in the November contest is Republican Peter Bundarin, a proponent of the Petaluma plan to control growth.

The major tenet of that program is to issue a limited number of building permits and thereby control and direct the growth of the township.

Assuming it can be legally applied to Canton, and administered fairly, it still is a great deviation from the controversial Greenstein concept to

save western Canton for agricultural use.

And it means to all residents of the Plymouth Community School District that another look at the future growth of the district is warranted.

Either way you cut it, and with either candidate, it can be assumed that Canton will be developed in a different fashion and probably more fully.

So where does it all leave the school district?

Up in the air, no doubt.

Already the school system is feeling the tremendous impact of Canton's growth. Three new schools will open in the fall to service Canton's needs, and the budgetary pressure compounded by other fiscal problems has been enormous.

Canton's leaders in the next few years are going to have their work cut out for them.

Single family homes are not a tax plus, and until the township attracts needed commercial and industrial tax base, it looks like the school system is going to be under a great deal of fiscal pressure.

If Canton's newest batch of leaders are to devote themselves to any single purpose in the next two years, they had best pay close attention to land use planning.

So had Canton's neighbors in the communities of Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

Because the decisions made, either under Stein's direction or Bundarin's, will be choices that not only Cantonites, but neighbors sharing the school system will have to live with for a good long time to come.

Will post office kiss & tell?

To the dismay of larger charitable organizations, Congress is seeking ways to tell you things you always wanted to know about the finance of charities but didn't know how to find out.

The House post office committee is working on legislation requiring charities using the mails to disclose in every solicitation some of their most sensitive financial information—the amount they spend to raise money and pay other operating costs.

The theory is that contributors should know what they are getting or not getting for their money. The legislation will provide some benchmarks for the public to prudently judge various organizations which are competing for the charitable dollar.

EXECUTIVES OF A number of well-known charities are wary. They feel that the legislation will hinder operations by raising costs and confusing the public, while failing to stop fast-buck artists who flaunt the law anyway.

The sponsors of the bill claim it wouldn't impose a vast new set of regulations on charities and wouldn't create a new bureaucracy. The proposed laws would be enforced by the United States Postal Service and would simply require charities to report in each solicitation how much of their contribution is actually spent on charitable work and how much on other fund-raising costs.

Nothing in the measure sets a limit on how much charities can spend for expenses, but its sponsors expect the charities with the lowest ratio of expenses to contributions would probably enjoy the greatest public support.

CONGRESS HAS WORRIED for a number of years how to police charitable contributions. Americans contribute \$26 billion a year to philanthropic causes.

While much of that is given to local institutions

such as churches and schools, billions of dollars are raised each year by broad appeals through the mail, on television and on radio.

A Senate investigation in 1974 disclosed a number of cases in which donors and beneficiaries appear to have been short-changed.

One group raised \$10 million over 10 years to help asthmatic children, but spent only 15 cents of each dollar on the children's behalf.

There was also a group of missionary fathers in Baltimore who raised millions of dollars through nationwide fund-raising sweepstakes but apparently very little was spent for overseas missions.

THE CHARITIES retort that they should be required to supply the information only to those who are really interested. To do more would increase the cost of raising money.

They also claim that some fund-raising techniques are appropriate for one organization but are entirely inappropriate for another.

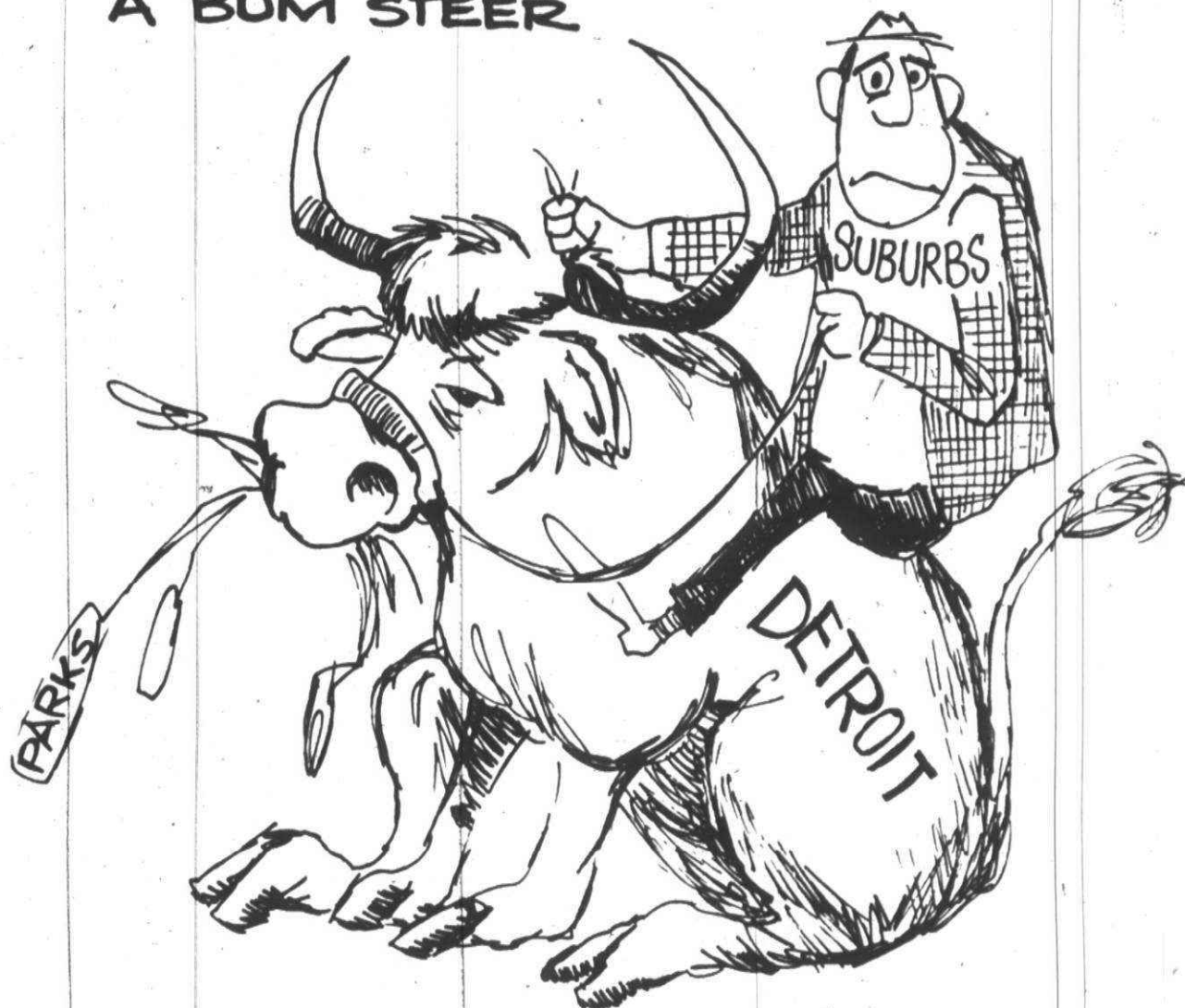
A massive, broad appeal is more expensive than door-to-door solicitation by volunteers, but it is difficult to raise money for problems like alcoholism, epilepsy and venereal disease on a door-to-door basis.

What it boils down to is that some charitable organizations are designed to help the less fortunate but others exist to give their staffs jobs.

If the cost of raising money is more than half of that collected, the wrong charity is benefitting.

It looks as though Congress is on the right track this time.

Detroit'll give up Rouge but take federal funds

What business is it of a smart-aleck suburbanite, you may ask, if Detroit wants to practically give away one-third of that lovely Rouge Park?

It's their park, isn't it? If they want a federal solar institute there, isn't that Detroit's decision?

No, frankly it isn't Detroit's decision to make alone. We suburbanites, both as regional citizens and Americans, have sound reasons to squawk at the Rouge Park shenanigans of Mayor Coleman Young's administration.

The politics of it all is byzantine, so get ready.

DETROIT, ITS mayor and council are offering 328 acres of Rouge Park to the federal government for \$1 to induce the feds to build a \$20 million solar research institute in the area.

Meanwhile, with the other hand, the Detroiters are asking the Federal Bureau of Outdoor Recreation for \$4 million to buy 30 acres of riverfront property. The purpose is to make a chain park along the Detroit River from Belle Isle to the Renaissance Center.

The economics of it is pure hayseed. Detroit buys parkland in one part of the city and tries to give it away in another part. That imbecility would be purely Detroit's business if it were buying the riverfront land with its own property tax money.

But it's not using its own money. It wants to use federal money to buy the riverfront land, and that's where all the rest of us Americans come in. We must object.

DETROIT, we have been told at great length, is in tough shape, losing business and good residents and spawning nothing but problems. Everybody else ought to help out—so the theory goes.

The theory, unfortunately, doesn't work, and Detroit's thinking on parks is an elaborate case in point.

Detroit for decades wanted no part of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority (HCMA) parks in its bailiwick. So HCMA collected proper-

ty taxes from Detroit and five counties, and proceeded to develop 10 metroparks in the hinterlands of the region.

In recent years, Detroit has changed its mind and has begun complaining that HCMA is siphoning tax money out of the big city and transplanting it to the boondocks. Bills appeared in the Michigan Legislature to force HCMA to develop something in Detroit.

HCMA's response was an offer to take over the operation of Belle Isle, there being no sizable chunks of land available to develop a new park and Belle Isle being a regional facility anyway.

TO MAKE A LONG story short, Detroit said no to the Belle Isle plan, just give us money.

HCMA isn't about to give away our tax money, so under pressure from the legislature it started negotiations on the riverfront park idea.

Again Detroit's response was negative. Just write us a check, and we'll spend it, Detroit said. And Detroit went on to offer one-third of Rouge Park for \$1 and ask for \$4 million to acquire riverfront parkland.

It's pretty obvious Detroit's administration and council are less interested in parkland and high finance than they are in controlling money and controlling jobs—our money and their own municipal union's jobs.

As I said, the politics of it is byzantine; the economics is hayseed; and as for municipal management—well, Detroit's a nice place to visit but I wouldn't want to live there any more.

Traditional business districts keep pace with times

One of the most important but least recognized factors that affects the character of individual suburbs in which we live is the kind and texture of commercial development.

Livonia, for example, is substantially affected in its basic character as a city by the fact that its two main commercial areas are shopping centers. Rochester, on the other hand, has a thriving main street and the atmosphere of a small, intimate town.

Two outstanding examples of excellence in commercial development in this area are the downtown shopping districts of Plymouth and Birmingham.

Both are based on the classical model of the downtown of a small town. Both are planned for diversity, intimacy and a wide range of human-scaled shopping and browsing activities. Both have as their core lovely parks, Kellogg in Plymouth and Shain in Birmingham.

And both downtown business merchant communities contribute much more than is commonly recognized to their parent cities' tax base. In Birmingham, for example, downtown businesses contribute an estimated 35 per cent of the total city tax revenue.

RECENT events, moreover, give strong indication that the downtowns of both Plymouth and

Birmingham will continue to evolve with the times.

In Plymouth, former mayor and city commissioner Harold Guenther earlier this week announced plans to rehabilitate the old brick building next to the railroad tracks on North Main into a modern restaurant mall, with the added possibility of a summer theater.

"The only hope for the future of Plymouth is to develop unusual businesses and shops that will attract people from all sections and put the city on the map again," Guenther said.

Plymouth contains only two square miles, with little room to develop an industrial tax base. What's worse, Plymouth's main industry, Daisy Air Rifle, moved to Arkansas some years ago.

"There was a time when Plymouth was known around the globe," Guenther explained, "when the Daisy Air Rifle was manufactured here. Now we must do something to bring back that sort of attention."

"So we have to turn to business. And I am hoping that in the proposed mall we will have the type of shops that advertise in national magazines and attract people—and mail—to us," Guenther added.

The Plymouth industrialist explained that he got the overall idea for his development strategy on a recent trip.

"On our recent trip to Williamsburg, Va., Mrs. Guenther talked me into going miles off the beaten path just to pick up an article she saw advertised in one of the specialty magazines. We could have such things right here in our city," Guenther said.

DOWNTOWN Birmingham has long been regarded as one of the finest, most diversified shopping areas in the entire state.

Recently, however, local merchants have become aware that further progress was necessary to continue to compete effectively with other developing shopping areas.

Working in the finest tradition of local self-help, a group of downtown Birmingham businessmen started meeting informally to develop ideas and begin the process of getting wide community support.

Improvement of parking, more flexible zoning regulations, and imaginative development of underused parcels of land, and a host of other ideas are on their minds.

Sparkplugged by Meyer Kershenbaum, whose family owns the Kay Baum shops, the group has already reached out and established linkage with the chamber of commerce, through its new executive director, James Zeder.

While nothing is in the formal stages, long-time Birmingham observers say the group represents one of the most positive forces seen in Birmingham in many years.

THE VIGOR and vitality of America has traditionally come from the business community in many important ways.

In two suburbs, much alike yet very different, we have two examples of the foresight and imagination of local businessmen, working to make their community better.

It's enormously encouraging, and I wish these men—and others like them throughout these suburbs—all the success they deserve.

Cities can cash in on fed funds

All Wayne County communities will be eligible for federal funds under the recent public works/countercyclical bill passed by Congress over President Ford's veto.

Specific amounts for communities of more than 50,000 population in Wayne County have been announced: Livonia, \$120,500; Westland, \$99,600; Detroit, \$19.2 million; Dearborn, \$252,500; Taylor, \$254,500; Lincoln Park, \$76,100; and Dearborn Heights, \$71,800.

An estimated \$20 million will be made available to counties and communities throughout the state with populations of less than 50,000.

The Wayne County share of countercyclical funding will be about \$4.5 million over a 15-month period, beginning in September. In addition, the county plans to obtain at least the same amount for public works projects.

"The exact dollar amount that will be made available for smaller communities in Wayne County has not been reported to me as yet, but I anticipate at least several million dollars for public works projects and several million dollars more as direct funding through the countercyclical provision in the bill," said John Barr, chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

However, because a complex formula based on population, unemployment rate and local tax effort are involved in determining the exact allocations, Barr said it may be several weeks before details of distribution to communities of less than 50,000 will be available.

In letters to Wayne County mayors, Barr promised to relay information as soon as it is received.

"This includes rules and regulations whereby local units may apply for public works project funding," he said. "All communities within Wayne County should be eligible provided their unemployment rate is above the national average—and to the best of my knowledge this is the case in every Wayne County community." □

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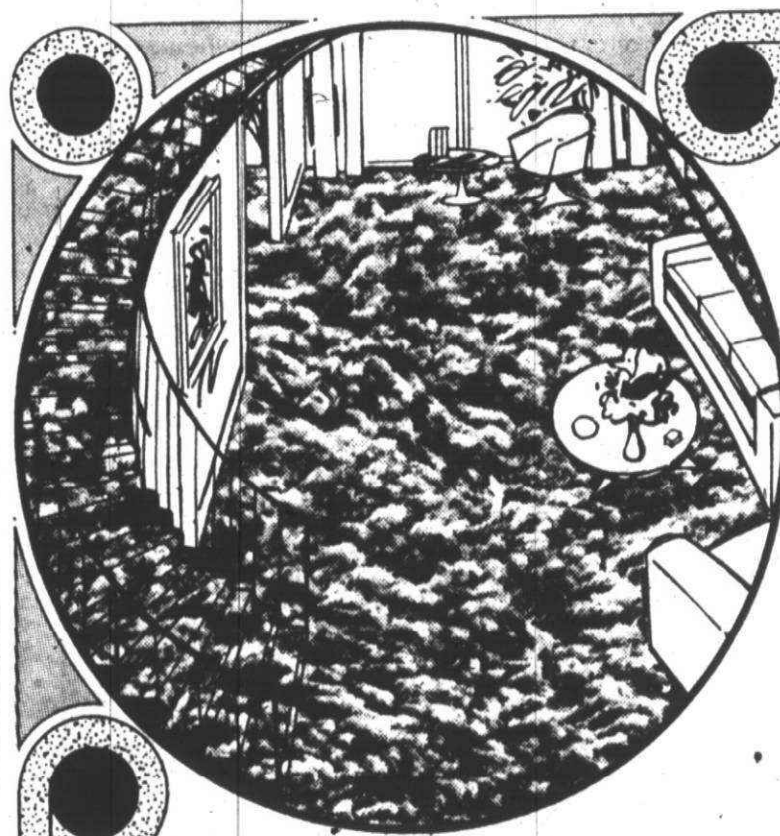
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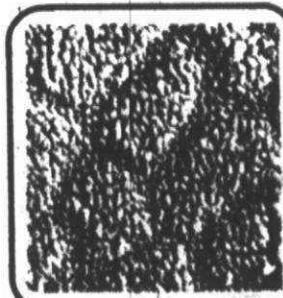
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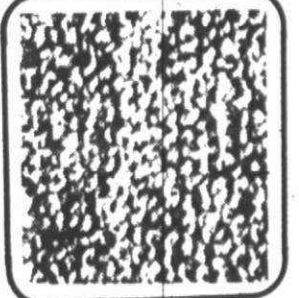
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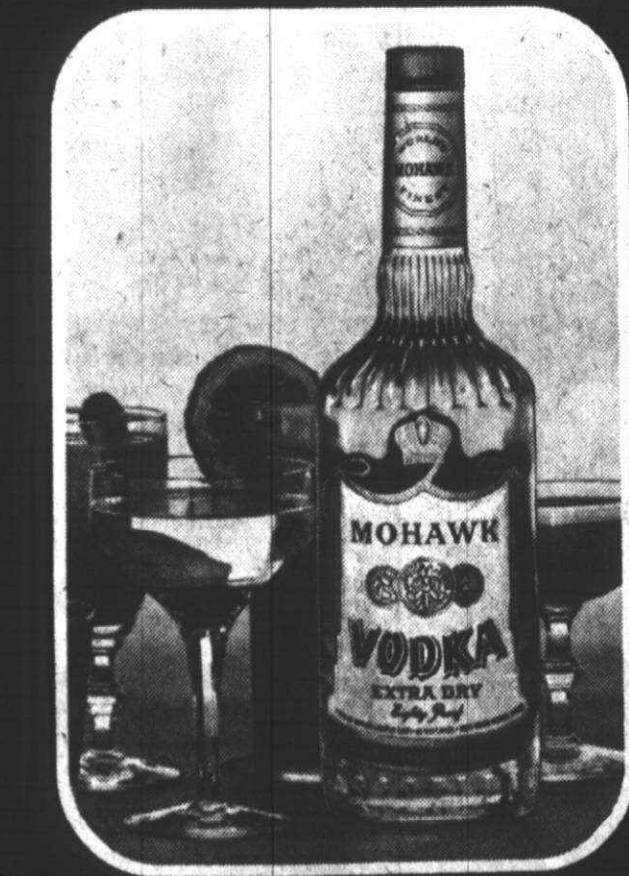

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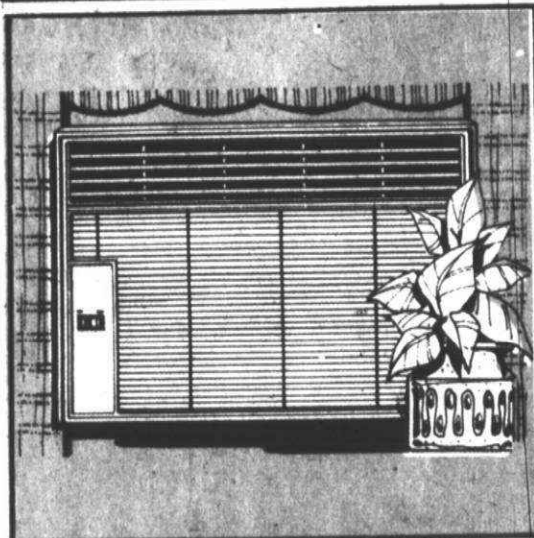
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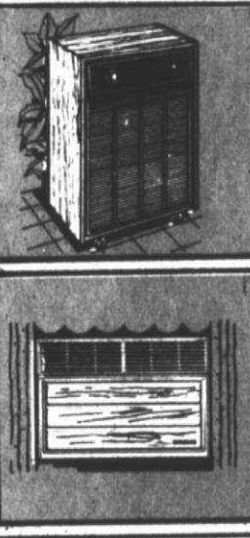
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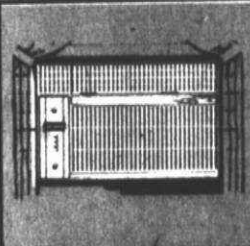
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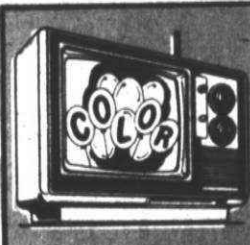
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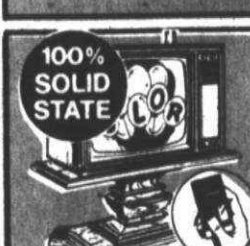
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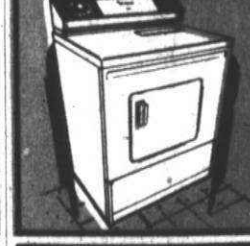
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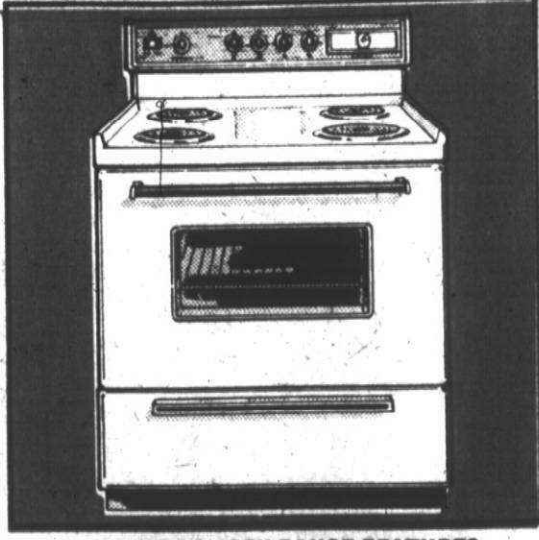


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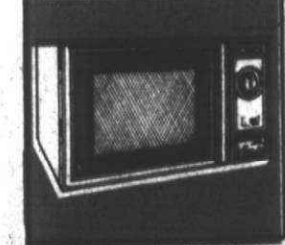
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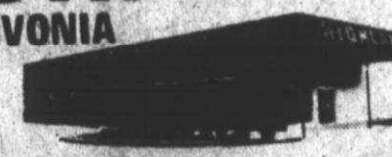
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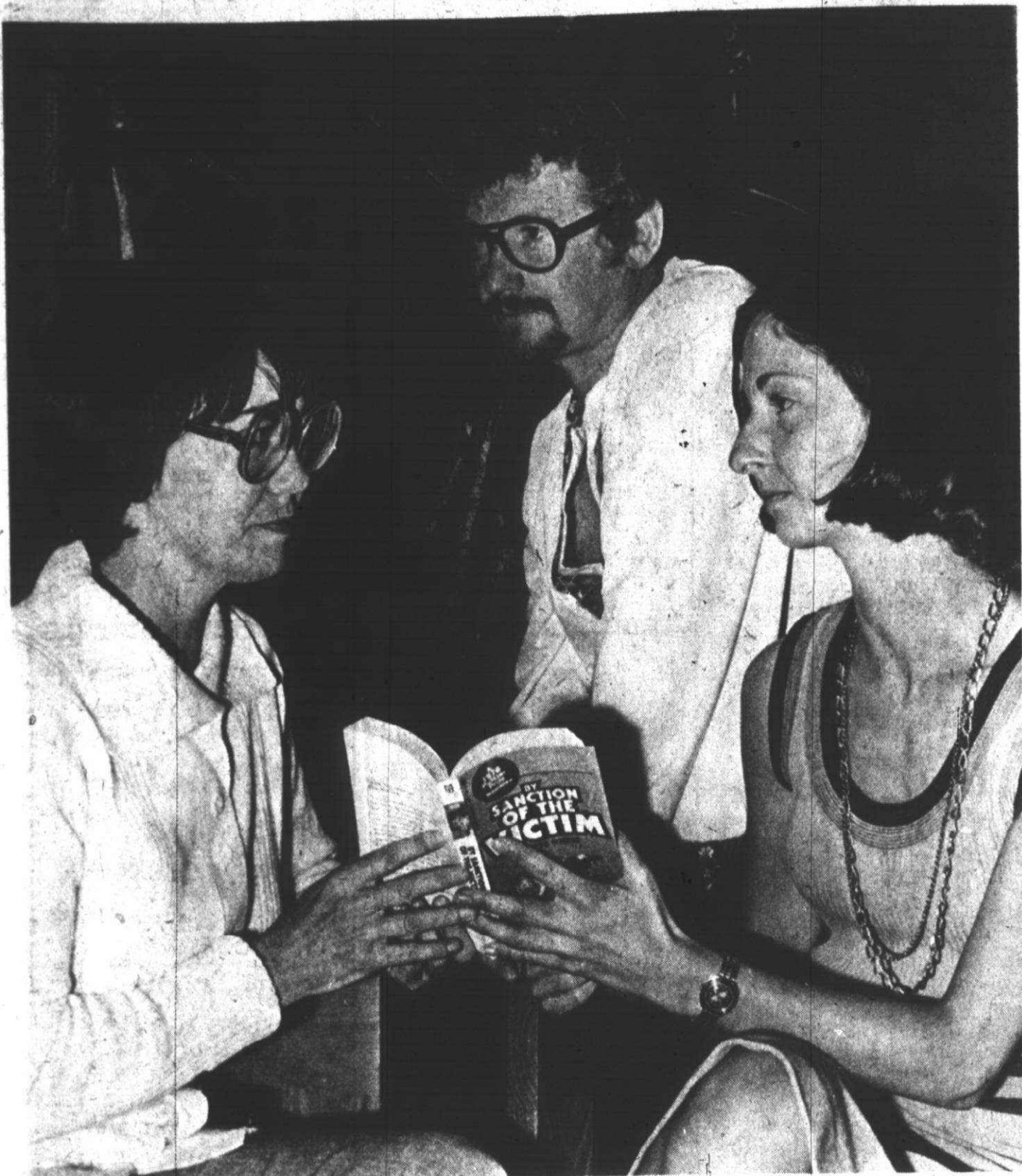


CHILD ABUSE

Everybody shares its responsibility and feels its tragedy



"If we are willing to take an honest look at our lives," says novelist Patte Wheat, "we find that child abuse is a personal issue with every one of us."

Child abuse isn't an isolated problem that affects a few unfortunate youngsters and happens to other classes of society.

Rather, it's a part of every strata of society—probably every family to some degree—and it may be the primary reason for the escalating crime in this country.

That's the message being taken around the country by two representatives of Parents Anonymous, a nationwide organization to combat such abuse. They are novelist Patte Wheat and clinical social worker Leonard L. Lieber, PA's national administrator. They stopped at the Plymouth Hilton hotel during a brief visit for radio and television appearances in the Detroit metropolitan area.

"We're all capable of abuses, given a situation of sufficient stress," said Ms. Wheat, who has just written "By Sanction of the Victim," a novel depicting an extreme abuse case placed in a family setting.

"I don't know any parents who have not on occasion been abusive," she added. Lieber looked at the matter from a little different angle.

"We've already lost a president to child abuse," he stated.

"Lee Harvey Oswald was an abused child. So are many others who have come into the news for other killings, and a large percentage of the 17-year-olds in street gangs knew abuse as seven-year-olds."

IN THEIR VISIT here, Ms. Wheat and Lieber also talked about recent governmental recognition of the enormity of the problem and the funding of Parents Anonymous work, of visits around the country with units of PA and of incidents in visits to many cities that show the problem is coming into the open.

That wasn't the case, the writer said, when she first began recognizing the problem about 1965, five years before Lieber, the counselor, and Jolly K., a prisoner held in a child's death, began the organization of Parents Anonymous.

Mrs. Wheat said it was when her own three children were aged 10, eight and

three, that she read an account in Time magazine about a teen-aged girl who was left by her parents with a woman who "disciplined" her to death.

"I guess even then, as I read the story treated as an isolated murder, I had a feeling on the gut level that there was in this country a great hypocrisy, on the one hand child worship and on the other hand a history of doing very little for children."

"My research went on, and I collected more news stories and heard of more incidents. I learned, although the term 'child abuse' wasn't in common usage then, that it represents a pattern, with the parent who has been hurt as a child unable to treat his own children any differently."

"More and more, I realized that as parents we are no better nor worse than the parenting we received, unless therapy intervenes."

MS. WHEAT also talked of "institutionalized" child abuse, which she said results from "apathy and government greed," in the way prisons put young delinquents into the company of older and more hardened criminals.

"As long as brutality in any sector of our society is accepted, we will have child abuse," she added.

The period of study of child abuse and her eventual joining forces with the PA group as editor of its monthly newsletter also became a time of looking closely at her own life, Ms. Wheat said.

"I had a mother I always could talk to, and that part of my background was good," she said, "but I also had a father who walked out of our lives, and left that feeling of abusive neglect in me."

"I found that in dealing with my own children, I sometimes fell apart under stress, and then I became so fearful of this anger that I would withdraw from them."

"I know I have grown a great deal over the past 10 years and can handle this far better. I'm still growing and my relationships with my own children is far more open now."

BOTH VISITORS said a large part of their mission is to emphasize that child abuse is not just beating and physical harm.

"You can wreck someone's self-esteem without laying a hand on him," the novelist said. "There's verbal and social abuse, and patterns of sexual abuse are just coming out."

"And then there's what we call the 'Beverly Hills syndrome,' the parents who are always out at social events, leaving the children the car and the liquor cabinet and the message 'don't bother me with your life.'"

"People don't like to recognize that kind of abuse, but it is very much part of the scene."

WHILE IN THE Detroit area, Ms. Wheat and Lieber met with Jill Mauch of

Plymouth, a regional representative of Parents Anonymous.

Mrs. Mauch told them about the work that is being done here with a \$25,000 grant, part of money appropriated in 1974 by the U. S. department of Health, Education and Welfare's office of child development.

"We now have an office in Lincoln Park."

Mrs. Mauch said, "and parents interested can reach us by calling 381-5307 or 381-5308. We also have an emergency number for parents in stress situations, and that's in operation 24 hours a day in the office of Downriver Guidance, 383-9000."

She also said PA has an increasing number of units functioning in the metropolitan area, and further growth will become possible as more leaders volunteer services.

IT IS THIS KIND of groups, Lieber said, that is getting major attention in the appearance he and Ms. Wheat make around the country.

"This grant is a major breakthrough of recognition of this problem," Lieber said. "We hope to have it renewed when it runs out in another nine months."

"We want it known that this three-quarters of a million dollars is being matched all over the country by hours of volunteer work of equal value, and the impact is beginning to be felt."

"The reality of child abuse in its many forms is now out in the open. That's the

THE TOUR also is aimed at publicizing Ms. Wheat's new book, which already has 125,000 advance orders and has been nominated for a Pulitzer Prize.

It is, Ms. Wheat said, a fictionalized account of that first case of child abuse that caught her attention, and it was written because over the years the question that kept haunting her was how did it feel to be that young girl.

Lieber, in his preface, called the book one that "should become part of the growing recognized public awareness of our mutually shared responsibility—to make safe the formative years of all our families, our most important natural resource."

Program for families

Home getting set to help

The Methodist Children's Home, 22645 Six Mile, Redford Township, is now taking the first steps toward setting up a comprehensive program to aid abused children and their families.

Providing foster care homes for children under six is the initial goal of the program.

"We are still accepting applications from people wishing to be foster care parents for an abused child," said Jeri McKeon, case worker in charge of the project. "We need to have half a dozen specialized homes of this kind for children who can relate to others in a family setting."

"We will give supportive help to these foster parents to help them deal with the child's behavior."

Miss McKeon explained that a case work-

er would be assigned to each child and family to offer suggestions.

"We have a child care staff whose members will also be working with foster parents. If, for example, the parents on a certain day are overwhelmed, a child care worker can come in to give relief so they can get away."

TRAINING SEMINARS for foster parents will also be instituted by the Methodist Children's Home to offer explicit suggestions on behavior problems.

"Our goal is to return the child to its parents," declared Miss McKeon. "It's a short term care program. Hopefully the child won't be in the foster home more than six months or a year."

While the parents are separated from their children they will receive counseling

from the children's home staff whose emphasis will be on family therapy.

Other aspects of the three-part program which the facility hopes to launch in the future are the establishment of a human resource center to work with 12 families and a residential treatment program for children who have been severely abused on a long standing basis so they have to be removed from the home.

For the latter program, the children will live under supervision in a cottage on the grounds of the children's home.

"THE RESOURCE CENTER will deal with families with whom abuse is not chronic," noted Miss McKeon. "The children will continue to live at home, and their parents will come to the center for

counseling. We will work with families with young children to bring about changes in the abusive pattern."

These two programs are as yet unfunded.

Staff members of Methodist Children's Home turned their thoughts toward creating a program to ease the child abuse situation because of requests by the Michigan Department of Social Services and other agencies dealing with juveniles.

"Rather than just providing services for abused children, they want to get to the core of the problem," said Miss McKeon. "They want to work with parents to try to alter the abusive pattern."

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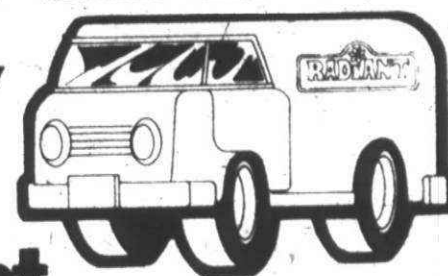

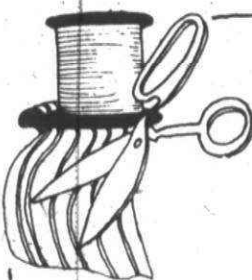
Straight ahead I found the lake, all right, but there were cottages close together and no sign of the public beach that had been described to me.

But I sure do hope our travelers to the west and to the east get directions better than those given their mother.



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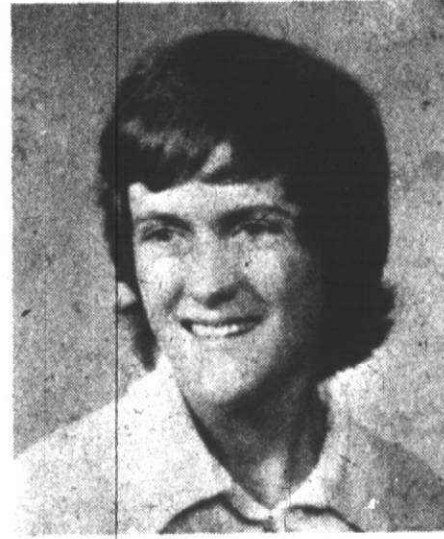

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Gerontology department now Madonna expands program

Madonna College of Livonia will expand its gerontology programs into a full department this fall.

Sister Colleen Morris, who developed many of the gerontology programs after joining the Madonna faculty in 1974, was named by Sister Mary Francilene, Madonna president, as chairman of the department.

"The study of gerontology, which has been a part of the sociology and social welfare department at Madonna, has previously been the province of the larger universities in Michigan," said Sister Colleen. "The well-known Institute of Gerontology of the University of Michigan and Wayne State University provide highly visible leadership in the field."

"Our program for gerontology professionals (there are now 75 majors in the department), as well as training programs for volunteers and paraprofessionals have

grown steadily, however, and we are expanding to meet this need."

SEVERAL NEW and enlarged programs have been added to the gerontology curriculum for the fall term, allowing students to earn a certificate of achievement, an associate or bachelor's degree.

To help bridge the gap between needs of the elderly and services presently rendered to them by various persons and agencies, Madonna will begin an interdisciplinary program introducing gerontology to all students.

Funded by a grant of \$48,000 from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare Office of Human Development, it will initially require study by all teacher education and social work students of a unit on gerontology.

Students in other major areas will also be encouraged to develop an awareness of needs of the elderly.

REPEATED and expanded for the fall term will be a free training program for paraprofessionals employed in nursing homes.

Forty students ranging in age from 18 to 50 were in such a program last year. They will stay on for an extension of the training and an additional forty-five paraprofessionals are being recruited to enroll in the skill assessment and development.

Another program in the fall term will provide tuition-free opportunities for deaf and hearing impaired persons 55 and older to enroll in enrichment classes.

Offered for ten weeks beginning the week of Sept. 20, the free classes as Leadership Training, at Madonna, Arts and Crafts, at St. John Deaf Center, Warren, and Creative Use of Leisure Time, at Detroit Hearing and Speech Center.

Sign language interpreters will be available at each location.

"SMALL COLLEGES recognize and value the leadership of larger institutions in new areas of study such as gerontology," said Sister Mary Francilene, "but small colleges have the facility to adapt quickly to surfacing needs."

"Our long-established sociology, nursing, home economics and family life departments gave us a natural lead-in to this developing and expanding career field," she said. She cited a report by the Institute of Gerontology indicating a need for more than 21,000 workers with the elderly in the Detroit area alone.

The popular training program, Volunteers to Assist the Aging, which in two years has developed a new awareness and understanding of the aging in over 350 persons, will be repeated beginning in November, she said.

'Non-ruling' still getting protests

Nearly four million letters and petitions have been sent to Federal Communication Commission headquarters in Washington within the past year, protesting a ruling on religious broadcasting that doesn't exist, TV Guide magazine reports.

The protests are directed at a reputed FCC ruling, reportedly encouraged by non-believer Madalyn Murray O'Hair, to have religious programming removed from the airwaves. But the FCC never made such a ruling.

Still the letters keep coming in, sometimes as many as 4300 daily. Henry Shockro, who handles administrative services for the FCC, said the last count showed 3,715,000 pieces of mail from angry citizens protesting the ruling.

No one really knows how the protest movement snowballed. Some believe it

may have been inspired by a petition filed in December, 1974, by broadcast consultants Jeremy Lansman and Lorenzo Milan.

"Their petition - RM-2493, to give it its proper name - alleged in part that certain fundamentalist religious institutions, which held broadcast licenses for educational stations, were in fact using them to air religious 'propaganda.' The petition asked for a review of the performance of these outlets to determine whether they were fulfilling their educational function," the magazine reported.

The FCC rejected the petition in August, 1975, but the National Religious Broadcasters incorrectly released a letter saying the commission had received 27,000 letters supporting RM-2493. That is believed to have started the flood of mail that still continues.

Eddie joins the pastor for ministerial team

A minister that speaks "out of both sides of his mouth" might have been run out of town in years past. But Dwight Wymer has incorporated his talent of ventriloquism into a part of his ministry to the extent that "Eddie" could almost be considered an associate minister.

"Eddie" is a three-foot hand-carved ventriloquial figure with a mop of hair and a wise-cracking manner.

"Using Eddie is a good way of getting people interested in Bible studies," said Pastor Wymer, minister of music and youth at the Merriman Road Baptist Church in Garden City.

He works with the educational program of his church, especially Sunday school and Bible schools. He has used Eddie in revivals, pastoral meetings, retreats, camps, and banquets.

"Eddie tells Bible stories and is sometimes just for fun—telling jokes and singing songs," he explained. Eddie has become so much a part of the youth groups

that the children ask where he is if I don't bring him along."

"We have a special service for the children geared to their level, and, using Eddie, the children respond very well."

PASTOR WYMER first was introduced to ventriloquism when he watched Paul Winchell and Jerry Mahoney on television and began practicing as a child with a play puppet of Jerry Mahoney.

After graduating from Blue Mountain College in Mississippi, he entered Golden Gate Seminary in San Francisco and purchased Eddie his first year in seminary.

He was inspired to use Eddie in his ministry when a visiting pastor used a puppet in evening studies where "everyone is usually bored."

"Everyone came alive when he pulled out the puppet, but he missed the boat by not using the puppet in his actual talk," said Pastor Wymer.

"I decided I wanted to use Eddie more effectively and have found that people really respond to him."

AFTER MINISTERING at the 19th Avenue Baptist Church in San Francisco part-time, he returned to his home state, and got his present position at Merriman Road Baptist Church, where he has been for two years.

"The national average is 18 months to two years for this type of position, but once you get through the second year, you know everybody," says Pastor Wymer. "I want to stay at a church long enough to grow a ministry and five years is really the minimum to put together a youth program."

"The older ones were set in their ways when I came here, but the seventh and eighth grade group developing now are really dynamos in this church," he noted of the group of 45, which he expects to double within a year.

Working with Eddie, at the Allan Dee Residential Center on Van Born and Merriman once a week, Pastor Wymer has found that adults even respond more to Eddie than children.

"It's sometimes difficult to work to a children's audience because the types of jokes and routines you use are sometimes over their heads and they don't catch the

humor," he explained, but added, "It's all part of the challenge."

USING EDDIE at a recent Pastors' Conference, Pastor Wymer enjoyed a good response from the audience, and also finds Eddie works well with older youth in camp settings.

"People will listen and accept things from Eddie that they don't accept from me," he said.

Being able to admonish people in a nice way is only part of the appeal.

"With drinking, smoking, and swearing, Eddie can really get all over people, and they hear him but they don't get mad at him," he explained.

Pastor Wymer has also discovered some of the pitfalls of working with a ventriloquial figure.

One of the girls at a children's meeting was acting up so Eddie called her up to the stage and challenged her to stay quiet while he tried to get her to talk.

"It didn't quite work out as beneficially as I thought it might because all the children wanted to misbehave so they could talk to Eddie," Pastor Wymer explained with a laugh.

He and his wife Vivian live at 31525 John Hawk, and as the father of four, he has found time to work with Eddie at Marquette school with an entertainment type program that he'd like to do more often.

"IN A SECULAR setting you can use more of the routines written down thorough the years which makes it easier for me," said the pastor. He finds writing skits the most difficult aspect of working with Eddie.

"My son has a play Danny O'Day puppet and he always wants me to write skits for Danny and Eddie. Coming up with new ideas can be hard," he added.

Recently selected one of the Outstanding Young Men of America, which is sponsored by the United States Jaycees, Pastor Wymer wants to expand his work with Eddie to include more adult audiences.

"It's an exciting thing being able to become two people," said the innovative pastor. "Everyone comes alive when Eddie's around and that's a fun thing to be part of."

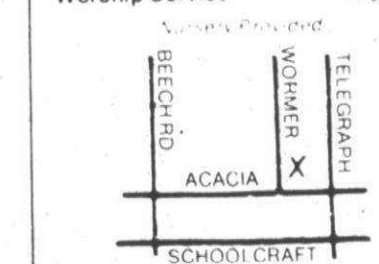

There were many upsets and supprises for candidates running for national office in districts including western Wayne County. The area totals reflected statewide results in the Democraticsenatorial race where U.S. Rep. Donald Riegler (D-Flint) pulled a stunning upset over challenger Sec. of State Richard Austin, the generally acknowledged front runner. The area also supported U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) in his bid for the Republican senatorial nomination. Dr. Edward Pierce trounced Livonia lawyer Marvin Stempien, a former state representative, for the Democratic nomination in the 2d Congressional District. State

Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) carried western Wayne County and the district to win the Republican nomination for the face-off with Pierce. The 15th Congressional races were uncontested and U.S. Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor) will challenge James Walaskay in the November election. Incumbent U.S. Rep. William Brodhead (D-Detroit) handily beat Harry Teachout for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 17th district. A Redford resident, Teachout lost to Brodhead in his own district. Brodhead will face James Burdick in the November presidential election.

Sarah Power chairs U.S. commission

Sarah Goddard Power has been elected chairwoman of the U.S. National Commission for UNESCO. Mrs. Power replaces Rosemary Ginn, recently appointed by President Ford as American ambassador to Luxembourg.

The commission is a 100-member body of individuals and non-governmental organizations created by Congress in 1946 to advise the U.S. government on UNESCO's programs and budget and to carry out programs in the fields of education, science and culture.

Mrs. Power is married to Philip H. Power, chairman of the board of Suburban Communications Corp. and co-publisher of Observer & Eccentric Newspapers. They reside in Ann Arbor.

She is a regent of the University of Michigan. Graduated from Vassar College and New York University, her previous professional experience includes work for Vice-President Nelson Rockefeller when he was governor of New York. She also worked for former New York City Mayor John Lindsay and with the New York City Commission for the United Nations and for the Consular Corps.

Mrs. Power has been a member of the U.S. National Commission for UNESCO since June 1973 and a vice-chairwoman since December 1975. She is a director of the United Nations Association of the United States of America and a director of the Associate Alumnae of Vassar College.

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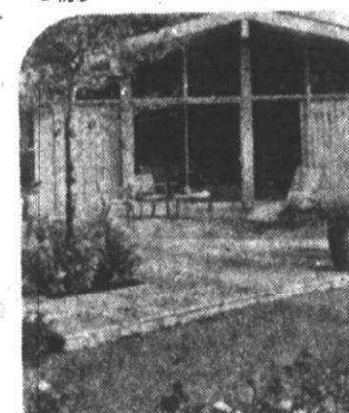

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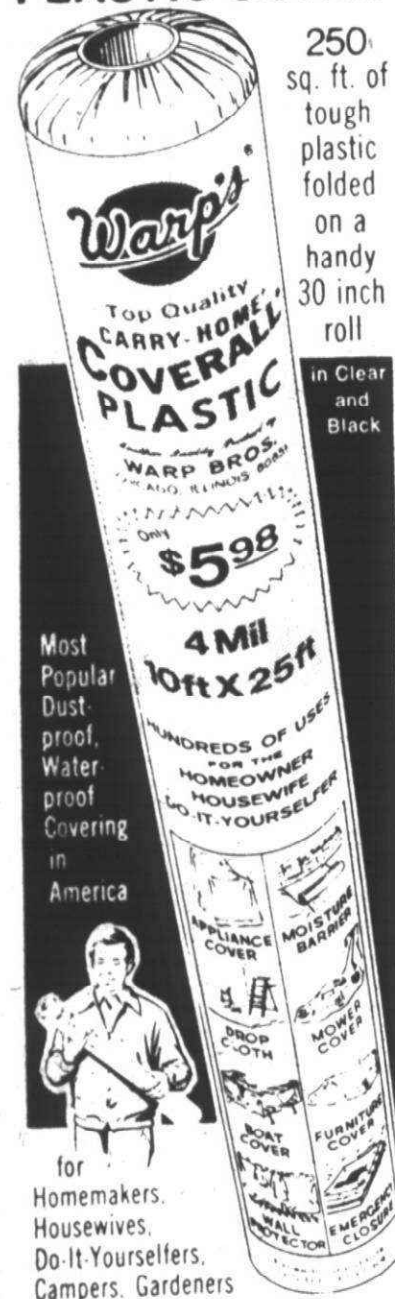
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Festival captures Arab mood

The smell of lahme mashwi (shish-kebab) and falafel sandwiches fills the air while young students dressed in traditional embroidered sounds of the strumming oud, eating derbuckee, the fife shebabi and the clapping of hands.

It's the food and music of the Arab world, delighting the 100,000 Arabs in the Detroit Metropolitan area and their American friends at the Arab World Riverfront Festival Aug. 6 to 8.

As part of the bicentennial celebration, "On Tour" program sponsored by the Smithsonian Institute, a special Egyptian folk dance troupe will perform exciting stick dances and harvest songs at the festival.

Wedding feast songs, challenge songs, healing songs and simple village songs will also be presented by the 26 musicians, singers and dancers ranging in ages from 16 to 60.

The group contains villagers from the Aswan, Sohag and Sharkiya regions as well as performers from Alexandria and Port Said.

"We are very lucky to have this troupe perform at our festival," said Paul Sa-

lami of Redford, public relations chairman of the festival. "They are a group well worth seeing."

Dressed in their native village costumes, the folk artists began their United States visit with a one-week appearance at the Festival of American Folklife in Washington, D.C. Their appearance in Detroit was made in cooperation with the Smithsonian Institute. The group will then go "On Tour" to communities across the United States, joining thousands in a bicentennial celebration.

Festival program chairwoman, Helen Salamy of Redford, explained that a cultural tent with artifacts from various Arab countries will be on display at the festival.

According to Miss Salamy, Arab contributions to civilization and native handicraft from Palestine, Lebanon, Morocco, Algeria, Egypt, Yemen, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia and Syria will be displayed at the cultural tent—another invention of the Arabs.

Miss Salamy said that a historical treaty signed by Morocco, recognizing the independence of the United States, is on loan from the Moroccan government and will be on display in the cultural tent.

"As I discovered, Morocco was the first country to recognize the United States," said Miss Salamy.

A special slide presentation relating the history of the Arab nations and their contributions will be shown in the cultural tent, she added.

Local residents working behind the scenes for a successful festival include Joe Razook of Redford and Fred Harb of Livonia.

Razook said he expects a crowd of about 100,000 persons to attend this year's festival.

"The Egyptian Folk group should draw a considerable number of people this year," he said.

As president of the festival committee, Razook has been overseeing the festival's operation from beginning to end, working closely with Harb, treasurer of the committee.

"There is a lot of hard work and time involved in the planning of the festival," said Razook, "but when you see the faces of the people light up, you know it was all worth it."

With over 25 Arab American organizations participating in the festival, food will be plentiful.

The Organization of Arab Students will feature their famous falafel (vegetable burger) sandwiches, the Palestine Red Crescent Society will have plenty of tabouli (wheat and vegetable) salad and the Arab American University Graduates will sell their homemade kibbie. Almost every booth will offer baklava for dessert.

Because of the continuing war in Lebanon, a number of booths will be asking for donations to aid misplaced and wounded Arab refugees. One of those booths is the United Holy Land Fund.

Dr. Eli Khoury, vice-president of the Detroit chapter explained that the United Holy Land Fund is a tax-exempt non-profit organization which raises funds for Arab refugees as well as aiding hospitals and clinics.

"One goal of the ethnic festival is to educate the public about the Arab culture," said Dr. Khoury. "The United Holy Land Fund is dedicated to aid the people and preserve their culture."

Razook explained that a banner will hang from the bandstand reading "Peace and unity throughout the world."

"This pretty much explains the feelings of all Arabs," said Razook.

Conducted brashly

Latin music sweeps Meadow Brook

Latin America sweeps through two hemispheres, with contrasts and wonders so vast that the voice of its symphonies ought to be as rich as the landscapes of cultures and nations.

That was the expectation before attending the Meadow Brook Music Festival concert Saturday night, an expectation disappointed by programmatic music which evoked more images of Saturday movie matinees than the plains and forests south of the Rio Grande.

Conductor Eduardo Mata from the National Symphony in Mexico City led the Detroit Symphony Orchestra through five compositions by three South Americans and one emigrant Spaniard. Each composer had taken small musical ideas and blown them out of philharmonic proportions to stultifying effect.

The first warning note was sounded as Mata led the orchestra through four national anthems. This was an honorable gesture, but it also showed how very ordinary and uninteresting an overload of such music can be.



FIRST UP came Alberto Ginastera's Pampeana No. 3, the Argentine composer's orchestral rendering of Pampa, the grassy plain which stretches flat and treeless from the Atlantic Ocean to the Andes.

Ginastera's musical treatment added very little to that simple topography, his minor chordings sounding much like experiments by Charles Ives.

Julian Orbon's Tres Versiones Sinfonicas at least evoked some symphonic energy, the middle of the three versions exhibiting a pleasing extension from a 12th-century French theme into a distinctive but somewhat hackneyed Latin style.

The versions before and after sounded intent on pressing their way into Western musical consciousness through the Hollywood Bowl.

In the second half of the Meadow Brook

concert, some strong, serious music was put out in three works by Carlos Chavez of Mexico, and Heitor Villa-Lobos of Brazil.

CHAVEZ EL SOL was wisely relocated to the penultimate spot on the program. A short choral work, El Sol is highly chromatic, often belabored paean to the "round, red sun, bright as a copper pitcher." This work did have a primitive Indian flair, though it was difficult to sort out the choral from the symphonic harmonies as they blew through the festival amphitheater.

The main attraction for the concert was a Villa-Lobos entry, not his larger Choros No. 10 for Chorus and Orchestra, but the compact, moody first half of Bachianas Brasileiras No. 5 for Soprano and Eight Cellos.

Here was a work that combined excellently a very familiar but freshly extended melodic line from the classical tradition with an undercurrent of sulky, half-wild rhythms. Topped by the excellent soprano

voice of Irene Gubrud, the Bachianas Brasileiras No. 5 was the aromatic treat of the evening.

The concert closed with the Villa-Lobos Choros No. 10, a selection that demanded attention, with themes handed off from French horns to the violins and returned over the smoky forestal sound of the cellos.

The Meadow Brook Festival Chorus performed valiantly for both the Chavez and Villa-Lobos works.

MATA CONDUCTED energetically, even brashly, bringing out an unbounded sound from the less distinctive works as if intending to fling the music straight uphill to the last patron on the Meadow Brook lawn.

For Villa-Lobos, Mata's efforts brought forth a very mature sound, closing phrasing in the Choros No. 10 often sounded agreeably like the great, sighing resonances of a fine cathedral organ.

Dressed in their native village costumes, folk artists from the East Delta of lower Egypt display their double reed flutes and tambourine. The Egyptian folk troupe can be seen at the Arab World Riverfront Festival Friday through Sunday.

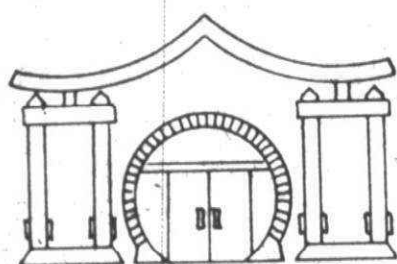

Theaters' seasons span 15 plays and 5 centuries

Fifteen plays representing five centuries of drama will be presented by Wayne State University at the Hilberry and Bonstelle theatres during the 1976-77 season, according to an announcement by Leonard Leone, director of the WSU Theatre.

This includes seven Hilberry repertory plays, the Bonstelle series of six, and two "firsts"—the debut of a new Black Theatre touring company and the first annual Blakely scholarship benefit.

The combined seasons, playing from October to June, will draw from the classics, modern drama, commedia dell'arte, black theater, French farce, musicals, and stage adaptations of narrative literature. Other plays to be added to the repertory and their official opening dates are: "The Lion in Winter" by James Goldman, Dec. 15; Shakespeare's "Othello," Feb. 2; Orson Welles' "Moby Dick—Rehearsed," an adaptation of Melville's novel, March 2; and G.B. Shaw's "You Never Can Tell," April 20.

Following the repertory season, the theater's new Black Theatre Touring Company

will introduce its first production, "The Sky of the Blind Pig," at the Hilberry. Performances of the Phillip Hayes Dean play are scheduled for June 1 through 4. It will be available for tour bookings during 1977-78.

The Bonstelle Theatre series begins Oct. 15 with "The First Breeze of Summer" by Leslie Lee. This is followed by Shakespeare's "Twelfth Night," opening Nov. 26; Rodgers and Hart's "Pal Joey," Feb. 4; Goldoni's "The Servant of Two Masters," March 11; "Five on the Black Hand Side" by Charlie L. Russell, April 22, and "Hotel Paradiso" by Georges Feydeau and Maurice Desvallieres on May 27. Bonstelle plays run for two week-ends, the mu-

American bumpkin foils oily English villain in play

The Greenfield Village Players have revived the celebrated early American comedy, "Our American Cousin," on the stage of the Henry Ford Museum Theater. Performances are at 8:30 p.m. each Friday and Saturday evening through Sept. 4.

Written by Tom Taylor, this 19th-century farce depicts the adventures of a Yankee—Asa Trenchard—abroad on a visit to the home of his English cousin. As one might expect, Trenchard's typical American outspokenness not only shatters the quiet of the countryside, but manages to upset the

smooth decorum of the English drawing room as well.

Predictably, however, Trenchard's bumbling awkwardness eventually works to his advantage, and he succeeds in defeating the deeds of an oily English villain.

PLAYING A supporting role in the drama is a 19-year-old Eastern Michigan University student from Westland, Jeanne Gurski. In addition to playing the role of Augusta, Miss Gurski, a vocal music major at EMU, readied the props and helped build sets for the play.

For this season's production, Kenneth Wilson takes the role of Asa Trenchard. His cousin Florence is portrayed by Deborah DeCocco. The play is directed by Dr. Joseph French, manager of theater arts at Greenfield Village and Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn.

This is the fifth revival of "Our American Cousin" by Greenfield Village Players. Other productions for modern audiences were in 1964, 1966, 1967 and 1970. "Our American Cousin" was first performed at the Laura Keane Theater in New York City on Oct. 19, 1888. Its theme is typical of many theatrical productions of the day when audiences delighted watching as the homespun, but nonetheless wise, Yankee farmer managed to outwit his foppish European counterpart.

FOLLOWING ITS first performance, the play continued as a popular comedy for several decades.

In fact, it was while watching a benefit performance of "Our American Cousin" on the evening of April 14, 1865, in Ford's Theatre in Washington D.C., that President Abraham Lincoln was assassinated. The chair in which he was seated that night, together with his shawl and theater playbill, are preserved in the Abraham Lincoln Courthouse at Greenfield Village.

In keeping with theatrical traditions of an earlier America, the cast serenades audience members as they sip lemonade in the torch-lit courtyard during intermission. Actors and actresses then lead the audience back into the museum theater for the second half of the play.

ALL SEATS for the play are reserved. Tickets may be obtained at the theater box office in the evenings of the performances or at The Dearborn Inn, 20301 Oakwood, Dearborn, and the Hyatt Regency-Dearborn, Michigan Avenue and the Southfield Freeway.

Corporation could aid group

Incumbents retained their parties' nomination Tuesday for the legislative seats open in the November presidential election. In the 33d district, William Keith maintained his lead in his home city of Garden City to sweep the Democratic nomination with a total of 2,336 votes. His closest challenger was Patrick O'Neil who got 1,517 votes followed by Edwin Markowicz with 864 and Arnold Lutz with 149. Redford's state representative John Bennett won a total of 9,004 votes, compared with his Democratic opponent, David Malhalab, who got 1,838. Bennett will face William Hopp in November for the legislative seat in the 34th

district. Incumbent Robert Geake won a total of 3,563 votes and will take on Democrat Jerome Harris, who won 2,026 votes, in the general election. The 36th district seat of John Markes was uncontested. Markes will challenge Republican Robert Law. In the 37th district, incumbent Thomas Brown defeated Brian Walker with 4,334 votes to 2,334 votes for the Democratic nomination. Brown will face perennial challenger Brian Kidston in November. State Rep. Roy Smith (R-Ypsilanti) ran an uncontested race and will run against Sally Roach in the general election.
