Police appointments approved by board

It was standing room only at township meeting hall Tuesday as the Canton Township Board of Trustees voted 4-3 to approve 26 appointments to the hotly contested township reserve police force.

In essence, the vote established the controversial force, despite approval in November 1975 of an ordinance providing for their creation.

The vote came in the wake of an emotional meeting a week ago Wednesday in which the appointments were effectively tabled when proponents of the reserve force were unable to muster a majority.

Trustee Jerry Cheske was "unavoidably absent" at that meeting but his presence Tuesday insured victory for Supervisor Robert Greenstein's forces, who have so actively supported establishment of the reserves.

AS ON WEDNESDAY, it was a block of three trustees, Bob Myers, Jim Poole and Brian Schwall voting no.

Greenstein was joined by Treasurer Carl Parsell, Cheske and Clerk John Flodin in approving the appointments.

The vote followed almost two hours of citizen debate, with most residents talking in favor of the reserves and citing rising crime as a critical problem in the township.

Spokespersons for several subdivisions said the reserves were desperately needed.

Bob Miller, a Greenstein appointment to the planning commission and his wife spoke strongly in favor of the reserves.

Miller said their visibility might prevent the burglaries and vandalism prevalent in the northwest sector of the township.

Tom Carman, Fellows Creek spokesman, said his subdivision, which has recently been plagued by vandalism, could no longer continue its own citizens patrol because of the lack of back up support without the reserves.

Others spoke of the long response time of the sheriff, complaining of a 45-minute wait.

While the vote insures there will be a reserve force at least until November, it is unclear when the reserves will begin their nightly duties.

A bid for liability insurance was approved by the board at an annual cost of about \$2,700, but until the policy is paid for, the reserves will not be allowed to begin work.

"I'm ready to go," said a smiling Carl Silvers, commander of the force. "I've had the schedules ready for two weeks now."

"THIS NEVER SHOULD have been a political issue," Greenstein said, "and whoever takes over this office in November is free to do what they want with the reserves. But now let's allow them to go on the street, be useful, and do a sincere and worthwhile job. Give them a chance to prove themselves."

Greenstein agreed with one audience

member, unsuccessful trustee candidate Noel Culbert, who said Canton needed a full time force of its own.

He suggested the board attempt a millage drive on the next ballot.

Greenstein agreed a fulltime force was needed and admitted the reserves were an interim measure.

But he said the board was bound by the will of the people.

"Twice 1½ mills was defeated by the voters and until the residents of this township are willing to pay for a fulltime force we should try for the next best thing."

"This is only a stop gap measure, but the people have spoken and we have to listen. The reserves are not a fulltime force, but they are better than nothing."

Cheske said the board had to make a choice between a millage effort for a second fire station and a police force, "and we felt the fire station was the first priority."

MYERS, IN voting no listed 11 reasons against the reserves as presently constituted, citing economic reasons, lack of political safeguards, and the fact that it "was against the will of the people."

Poole said he saw a potential conflict of interest with the supervisor serving as police chief.

He said the reserves had gone from a traffic control device to a fully authorized police force. He applauded the dedication of the reserves, but said he had searched his conscience and couldn't vote for them.

Timbario signed letter, investigation continues

Planning commissioner Tom Timbario laid to rest any questions about who signed a letter distributed late in the primary campaign alleging that Supervisor Robert Greenstein referred to mobile home owners as "trailer trash."

On Tuesday night, a tight lipped Timbario issued the press a seven-point statement explaining why he signed the letter and how he had become disenchanted with Greenstein.

Timbario, a former supporter of Greenstein, was appointed to the planning commission at Greenstein's request.

Despite Timbario's admission of signature, the Wayne County Prosecutors office is investigating the incident, alleged by Greenstein to be one of many dirty tricks used against him in his unsuccessful campaign for re-election.

Greenstein, who said after Timbario admitted signing the letter that "nothing surprises me about this campaign," had earlier maintained the letter was fraudulent and forged.

He went Monday to the prosecutor's office seeking an investigation into the matter. He said the letter was "a pack of lies" and constituted an unlawful act, because it improperly influenced the Aug. 3 election.

Greenstein said while the letter was not forged—in light of Timbario's statement—it was still illegal because it was "completely untrue."

For reasons unclear at press time, the State Police, Plymouth Subpost were investigating the matter, although they had not been asked to by the prosecutor's office or the state elections committee.

A spokesman said Wednesday they had dropped the matter and that it had been turned over in full to the prosecutor's office.

IN HIS TWO page statement, Timbario said Greenstein had pressured him to sign an affidavit "indicating I did not sign the letter."

"I refused to sign his affidavit spite of his attempt to intimidate and pressure, because it would not have been truthful."

"The pressure however seems to be consistent with his attitude concerning the relationship between citizens and their elected officials."

Timbario reiterated his statement that the letter was "true and factual."

Earlier, he had refused to say whether or not he signed the letter although commenting he had nothing to do with its distribution.

Trustee Robert Myers admitted he was behind the distribution of the letter and added that he had personally paid for duplication of the letter as charged by Greenstein.

In his statement Timbario listed seven reasons for signing the letter.

They were:

•Greenstein taking credit for the master plan concept "when in fact nearly a dozen township goals specifically related to Agricultural-open space preservation, reduced tax burdens for farmers" were developed by the original 25-member Citizens Advisory Council in 1973.

•Greenstein telling him that "I must be insane for suggesting a member of the farming community be appointed to the planning commission as Bob Simmons' replacement and that only people sharing the same thinking as the administration should be appointed to the planning commission."

•"Being told by a member of the administration that subdivision homeowners would have to pay almost a quarter of a million dollars for streetlight installation because of the administration's negligence in enforcing the township's current subdivision ordinance."

•"Announcing that the master plan is a revolutionary concept" when in it has been successfully accomplished in several other states.

•"Refusing to release publically the master plan critique by Professor Robert Hotelling, which was paid for with township funds, since the report suggested many alternative methods by which agriculture could be preserved."

•That Greenstein said concepts that might significantly affect the master plan be discussed in private among the boys before being made public. This way, the public would then be exposed to a "united position, and public discussion discouraged."

•That Greenstein took credit for commercial establishments built within the last year and a half "when in fact many of these establishments were approved before the Nov. 1974 election."

TIMBARIO SAID he was disillusioned and frustrated "in seeing the way the Greenstein campaign was being presented," and that he felt that mobile home owners "had a right to know just what Mr. Greenstein's private opinion and attitude is toward mobile home owners."

In his final volley, Timbario charged that Greenstein failed to "keep complete openness" in his administration.

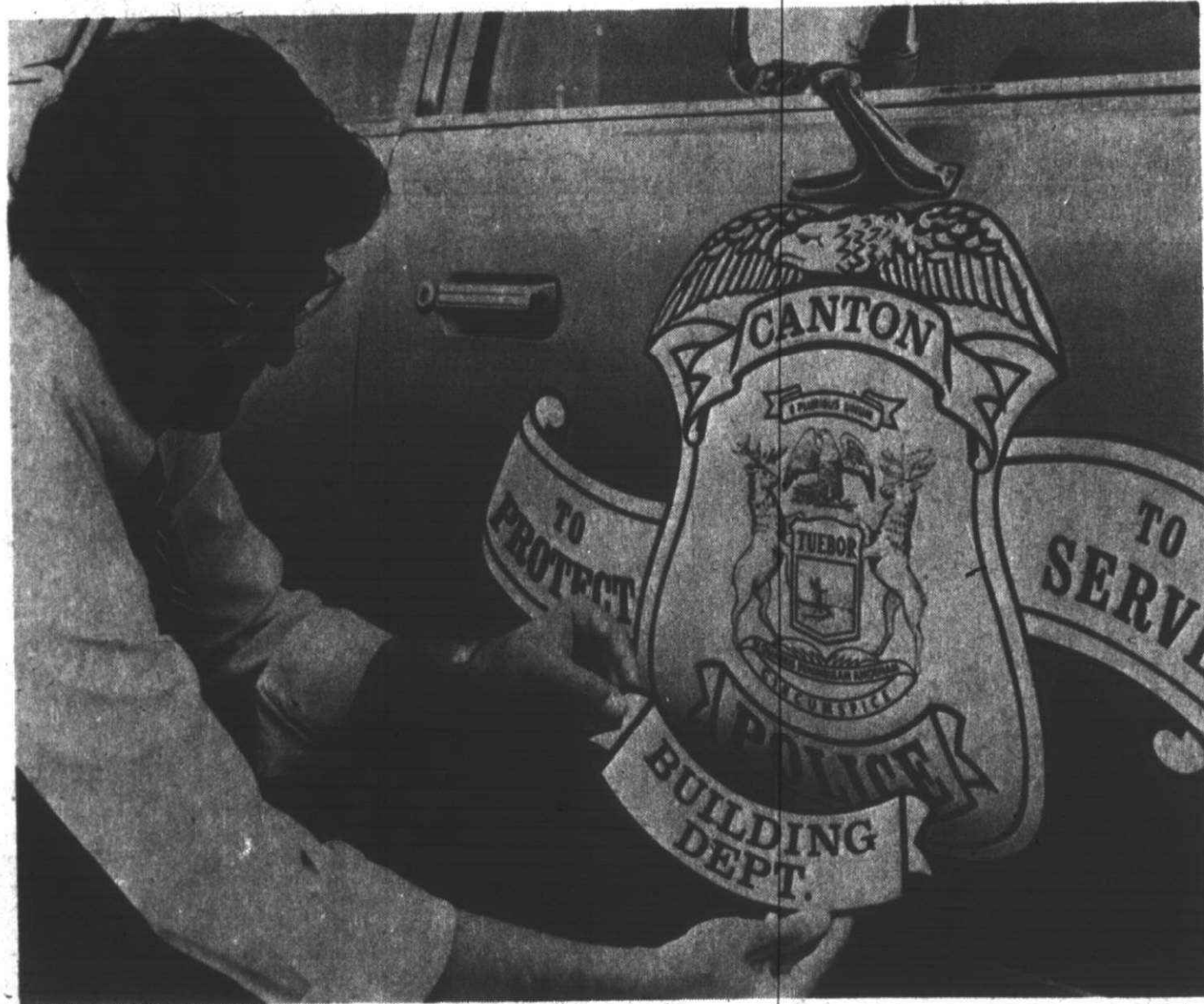
"Bob Greenstein believes what he does is right, and takes whatever steps are necessary to implement those beliefs," Timbario said. "I hope that this experience proves to be a lesson for all who are elected in the future. If this is the real world of politics, then the public deserves to know about it."

Greenstein said everything in Timbario's statement was "absolutely false" and he intended to continue his efforts to get criminal charges filed in the letter incident.

"A lie is still a lie at no time did I ever say that people who live in mobile homes are trash. I worked for them for five years for free and I think they got cheated out of their vote."

"A great majority of those people didn't

Phys ed requirements draw fire

The status quo of the Centennial Educational Park's (CEP) physical education requirements was supported Monday night when school board members failed to muster a quorum of votes needed to carry two resolutions regarding the CEP's second-year gym requirements.

Defeated was a motion by Trustee Marcia Borowski to eliminate the second-year physical education requirement as well as a motion by Treasurer Richard Arlen to refer the matter to the district's Curriculum Coordinating Committee (CCC).

With board President Joe Gray, Secretary Flossie Tonda and Trustee George Lawton absent from Monday's meeting, the remaining four board members needed a unanimous vote to take action on the proposed elimination of the second-year requirement.

THE LACK OF four votes also stymied payment of the bills, when trustees Marcia Borowski and Tom Yack cast "no" votes. The trustees objected to the administration's failure to answer Mrs. Borowski's questions on two of the bills.

The physical education issue was placed on Monday's agenda at the request of Mrs. Borowski who favors shaving the CEP's

gym requirements from two to one year in light of a possible millage defeat in September and a reduced, 5½-hour day at the CEP.

Mrs. Borowski, arguing that the CCC will not meet until September to discuss the CEP's physical education requirements, cast the one fatal, dissenting vote against Arlen's motion to refer the matter to the CCC.

"We have cut out all physical education requirements for elementary kids without referring to the CCC," said Mrs. Borowski, referring to one of the board's recent budget cuts. "We're now moaning and groaning over this."

"If physical education is so important, it's just as important for elementary kids—probably more so. I just think you're becoming illogical."

"If students are going to be limited to five hours at the park," she continued, "I only hope physical education will just be required for one year."

BUT KENT BUIKEMA, principal of Plymouth Canton High School, told board members he favors continuation of the two-year gym requirement. Elimination of the second-year requirement at this time, he added, would create enormous rescheduling problems.

"We have done considerable work in the physical education curriculum to involve students in life-time sports and prepare students for the greater amount of leisure time they will encounter," Buikema said.

"We feel the two-year requirement is a minimal requirement rather than a burdensome-type of requirement."

According to school Supt. John M. Hoben, a four-year physical education requirement once influenced high school schedules in the Plymouth School District. The requirements were later reduced to three years and then to two.

Currently, students must take physical education courses in ninth grade and an additional one year of gym in their sophomore, junior or senior year.

ALTHOUGH ARLEN supported Mrs. Borowski's motion to eliminate the second-year physical education requirement at the CEP, he moved to amend Mrs. Borowski's motion to implement the change during the CEP's second semester rather than the start of the school year.

With no support of Arlen's amended motion, board members voted 3-1 against Mrs. Borowski's motion and took no action on the physical education matter.

In other board action, Mrs. Borowski and Yack vetoed payment of the bills.

On Monday afternoon, Mrs. Borowski had requested the administration explain two bills—a rent payment for the CASTLES building and a uniform bill for the CEP band's Rifle Squad.

But when the answers were not forthcoming at Monday night's board meeting, Mrs. Borowski cast her vote against payment of the bills.

"I have questions on two items that aren't answered," she said, "so none of the bills will be paid."

Correction

Communicators wanted

Persons interested in becoming a link between their neighborhoods and the Plymouth Community School system are being welcomed by school administrators.

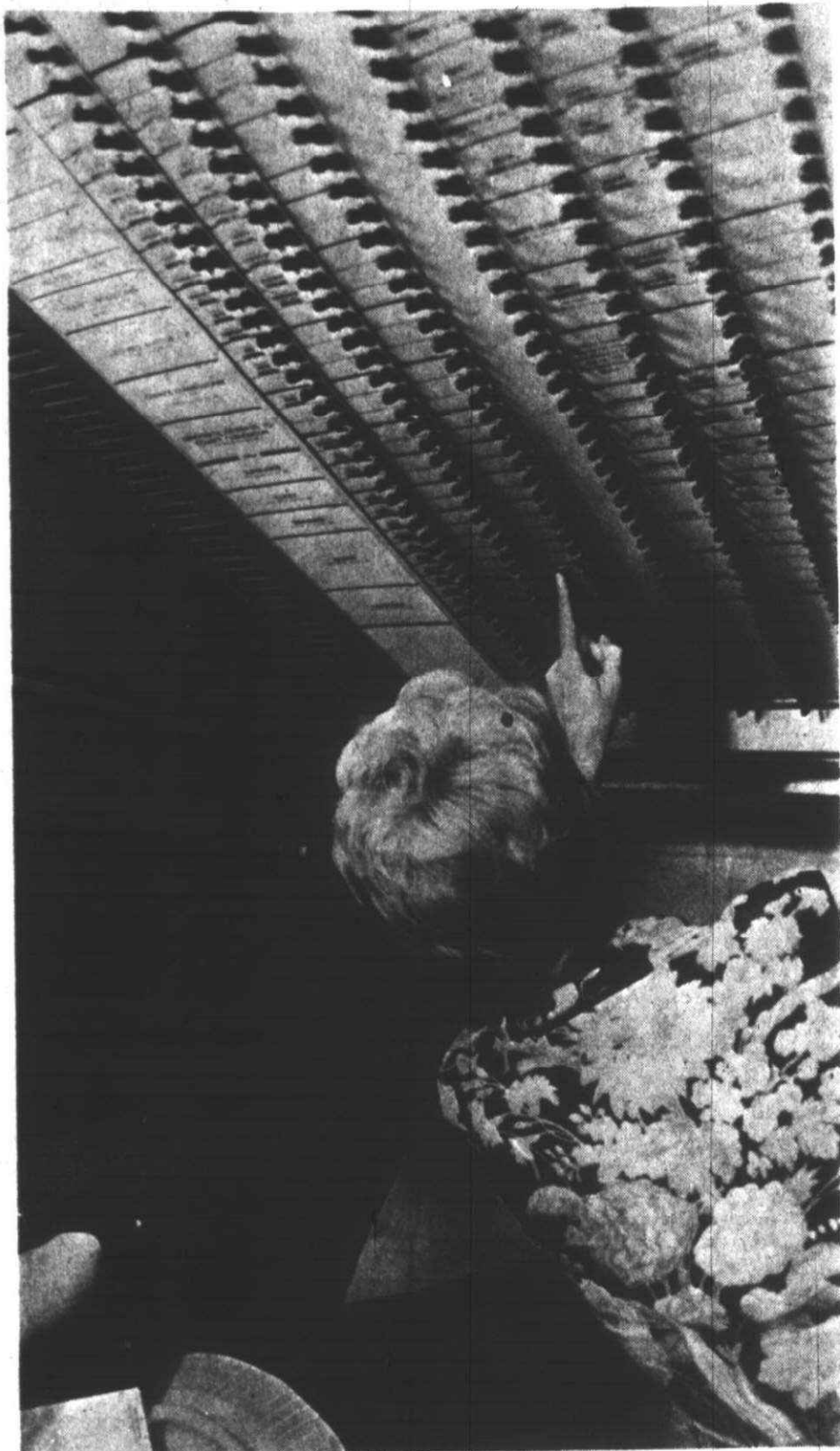

Election day means hard work at precincts

Running for office may take its toll on active candidates, but there's another group of people for whom elections mean work—and plenty of it.

They are the precinct workers and on election days, like Aug. 3, they put in long hours at the polls.

Election day starts early, at 6:30 a.m., and if everything goes smoothly, some 15 hours later around 10 p.m. after tabulating the vote, they can expect to go home.

During those 15 hours, pollworkers are instructed not to leave the polling place—and that means either a brown-bagged lunch, or a sprint by family members to the local burger palace for a cheese burger minus mayo.

The job is not entirely charity—workers received \$40 for their services and the satisfaction they helped implement one of the privileges, although not exercised by all citizens, of our democratic system.

WOMEN WHO staffed the polls at Canton's Precinct No. 3 said their main task was to alleviate some of the uncertainty voters face once they pull the curtains shut.

"The most common problem was that a lot of voters didn't realize they couldn't split the ticket in the primary election," Kathleen Byrd explained.

"When they found out they couldn't cross party lines, some people became

very disturbed. They wanted to know why and 'Who made up that rule?' We politely explained that those were the rules concerning primary elections. You get your chance to split your ticket in November."

Another common problem was the fact that many people in Canton vote in one place for school elections and another in township elections. That caused confusion and resentment from many voters, according to poll workers. The staff at the nine precincts were equipped with a map which outlined precinct boundaries.

"But I think some people who went to the wrong place got disgusted or didn't have time and just went home," Mrs. Byrd said.

The workers at Precinct 3 said courtesy was their main concern.

"IF SOMEONE has a problem, it's important not to treat them like they're some kind of jerk for asking a question," said Mrs. Jean Sheppard.

"For many of the people, this was the first time they'd voted in Canton Township and the first time they'd used that type of voting machine. I remember how scared I was the first time I voted. So we've done our job if we can put them at ease."

While many of the poll workers have strong personal views about the candidates and issues, Mrs. Byrd says the polling

place is no place to express them—regardless of good intentions.

"When we are in that polling area we are not to express an opinion, even among ourselves, regarding politics," Mrs. Byrd said.

"The same thing applies to school elections. I remember one year I was working at the polls and the precinct chairman said to the poll workers that everyone should be voting in favor of the millage."

"I was so angry that she expressed her opinion in a polling area," Mrs. Byrd said.

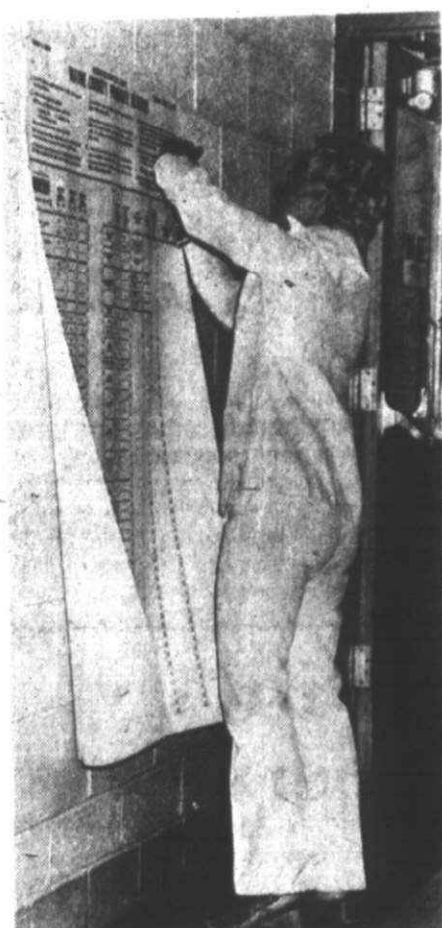
ONE OF THE reasons the poll workers signed up for election work is that they believe voting is important.

"I talked to some people and asked them if they voted and they said they never found time for it," explained Mrs. Byrd. "Then, when someone gets in office who they don't like, who's to blame?"

Mrs. Sheppard said there is no better example of the fact that each person's vote is important than the June 14 defeat of the school millage by one vote.

Aside from civic responsibility, Mrs. Sheppard admitted that "the extra money comes in handy."

"The pay I received from working at the polls last Tuesday paid for the food for a family get-together for my daughter's birthday," she said, laughing.

Mrs. Hamilton summed it up: "We feel that through involvement, we will achieve civic pride and better communication with-in the township."

Working closely with Mrs. Hamilton in the formation of the auxiliary was Joan Chakrabarty. Although the need for such an organization had been discussed for some time, it wasn't until the ladies attended a fire fighters convention in Ann Arbor in June of this year that they decided go ahead.

Four members of the Dearborn Heights Ladies Auxiliary attended the first meeting.

They learned of bylaws, charters, union dues, and how to arrange their association with the National Association of Fire Fighters Ladies Auxiliary.

Since then, things have moved quickly. With a few changes, they will adopt their bylaws, elect officers, receive their non-profit tax number from the State of Michigan and receive their charter.

"THE ADDITION of a second fire station in the township will bring more prospective members for the auxiliary.

"Out of nine fire fighters," said Mrs. Hamilton, "Some of them should be married." She explained that one of their present members, Connie, and one of their cadets, are planning a September wedding.

Members are Lois Daley, Mary Berger, Debbie Champagne, Dian Harrison, and Doris Kelley (honorary member).

know that I spoke on the floor of the legislature for them in Lansing to get their charter. If they had, they might have voted differently."

The supervisor said he didn't understand Timbario's reversal.

"WE HAD SOME disagreements over zoning on Canton Center but I don't think that was it.

"I just don't understand. He had one of my signs on his lawn and he crossed out Jerry Cheske's name and Joyce Willis' name so I took the sign back. But how does he support me one day and then write this the next."

Greenstein said he did, at one meeting in

the summer 1975, tell Myers, then a member of his slate, that "he didn't want trash like you moving next door."

"It was done in jest, as comic relief after he said he wanted to move his mobile home next door to me. There's was nothing malicious about it, it was a joke. But I never called mobile home owners trailer 'trash'."

He added, "It was just another one of the lies and filth that has been spread in this campaign and it was a complete misrepresentation."

Myers said the statement in the letter was completely true and that he had fired Greenstein from his position as attorney for the mobile home owners in 1970 because "he wanted the people to come to him instead of him going to the people."

Company to leave

The Anchor Coupling Co. Inc. that has been doing business in Plymouth area for the past 60 years, is considering closing the plant on Amelia Street in the Plymouth and moving to a location with more suitable facilities.

The decision was announced by James Elgin, general manager of the plant, who stated that the move is expected to be made within the next month or so.

The possibility of relocating, according to Elgin, is attributed to various factors that make the present facility inadequate for the company's growing operations.

Engaged in the production of hose assemblies for the automobile industry, the company has approximately 300 employees. Most of the employees are residents of Plymouth or the surrounding areas.

The proposed move already has been made known to the employees and union representatives.

Meetings with the union are scheduled to begin within the next week.

Should the final decision bring about the

closing of the plant it will be the third industry affected in the past year. The first of these was Evans Products Co. on Eckles Road. Next came Whitman and Barnes on Plymouth Road that announced a move to Augusta, Georgia, and now the Anchor Coupling Co. whose removal would leave a large gap in the industrial picture of the greater Plymouth area.

The Stroller

Carnival tricks nothing new

A sure sign that we were entering the fall season and the time when the county fairs become the most popular of all events came the other day when State Attorney General Frank Kelley announced in the public prints that he was considering investigating the games that appear on the midway of these annual functions when the farmers and the agricultural leaders hold sway.

He said he wanted to find out if the games were conducted honestly—whether there was a good reason why the ball didn't stay in the basket when you threw it. And he wants to know if the wheels at the baby doll stands are controlled by the man at the counter.

Well, take it from a fellow who knows, the man running the baby doll booth knows who is going to win. And the man with the bushel basket can make the ball pop out—anytime he wants to save one of the prizes on display.

Reading about the attorney general's plans reminded The Stroller of the day he was "educated" in the intricacies of the "con" games when he innocently accepted an offer to work for one of the "pitch" men at the Lehigh County Fair back home.

TO HELP out a neighbor who owned and operated a food concession, The Stroller, a mere youth, was serving a sauerkraut dinner to a man from one of the concessions.

"How would you like to come over and work with me?" he asked. "You can do it along with your job here—and I'll pay you one dollar a day."

It sounded interesting, especially when he told me that he had the baby doll stand

and all I had to do was come in and play when he called me.

"All I want you to do," he said, "is to drop by when you are answering a call from Mother Nature and you are on the way to get relief."

"You stand in the back of the crowd at the stand until you hear me shout, 'Please come in and try it for a dime.' Then you come in and play. When you win I'll give you the choice of the doll or a dollar. You take the dollar. That will be yours."

That sounded simple and more so when five other "pitch" men extended the same invitation. The Stroller still remembers the thrill of earning six dollars a trip just walking to the comfort station.

Then came the first trip. Standing at the rear of the gathering at the stand he finally heard the plea, "Please come in and try it for a dime." Heeding the call he worked his way to the counter where he placed a dime on a number and waited for the wheel to spin.

ANXIOUSLY, The Stroller placed his dime on a number. Sure enough, when the wheel stopped it was on his number. A great cheer went up when the gathering saw "the kid" win. Given the choice of the doll or the dollar he followed instructions and took the dollar that was pushed to him along with his original dime.

By the time he had returned to the sauerkraut stand, The Stroller had made six stops and had "earned" six dollars.

He had visions of making a lot of money—just imagine six dollars every time he heeded Nature's call.

But what an education he got later in the

day when he started on another round of the games.

At the first stop he waited again for the plea "Please come in and try it for a dime." This time when he placed his dime on a number he didn't win. "Try it again," the "con" man said. So, he placed another dime on another number—and lost. That's the way it went until he got to his 10th dime.

With the last dime of the original dollar the "con" man smiled.

This time the wheel stopped at the chosen number and the young helper walked away with a dollar.

Can you imagine that, he thought, that fellow at the counter must control that wheel. He must know where it will stop. Or he can stop it where he wishes.

His education became complete when he experienced the same treatment at the other five stations.

IT WAS QUITE an experience for a young fellow, but he learned that all is not gold that glitters. And he learned that the games are just a "come on" to the farmers.

So, Mr. Kelley, you don't have to go very far in your planned investigation. Just walk along the midway at the fair where the games are being played, and wait for the "pitch" man to plea, "Come in and try it for a dime."

Then watch what happens. Maybe you will learn the lesson just as The Stroller did a half century ago.

Vitamin C helps fish

Scientists have known for years that fish use vitamin C for proper bone growth and to increase their tolerance to environmental stresses. Yet they never knew exactly how this occurred. Now they do, and the discovery may help biologists in combating the effects of pollution on fish, the Department of the Interior announced.

Biologists at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Fish Pesticide Laboratory in Columbia, Mo., first learned of the mechanism while studying catfish that were affected by the insecticide toxaphene. This pesticide is widely used on cotton crops in the South where channel catfish are also commercially raised.

About six years ago, biologists noticed that the channel catfish grown on fish farms in that area were developing a curvature of the spine that, in extreme cases, broke the fish's back and stunted growth as much as one-third. Last year, Fish and Wildlife scientists linked this syndrome to toxaphene residues in the water. Concentrations as low as 37 parts per trillion in the water were found to have serious long-term effects on catfish. Earlier this year, they documented for the first time the specific role vitamin C plays in this process, and the implications of fish in the wild, the discovery of its importance in fish metabolism has been quite beneficial to the multi-million dollar fish farming business of the South, where up to five per cent of pond-cultured catfish showed the symptom. Vitamin C is now included in many commercially prepared fish foods, and its inclusion in the diet of farmed catfish is helping to eliminate the "broken back syndrome."

However, the discovery of vitamin C's importance in fish metabolism is equally beneficial to biologists studying the chronic effects of pollutants. Biologists believe that the mechanism which fish use in detoxifying toxaphene is the same used to neutralize the effects of other pollutants, but further studies are necessary before any firm conclusions can be drawn.

The standard rule is that all elected pre-

cinct delegates and all paid-up party members may attend the state convention as delegates.

District conventions may also take care of one other routine but honorary chore: picking a person to be the official member of the Electoral College. If Jimmy Carter carries Michigan in the presidential election, the local member of the Electoral College will cast one of the state's 21 electoral votes for Carter.

THE STATE CONVENTION will pick the party's candidates for three state supreme court seats and two members each for three university boards.

Chief Justice Thomas Giles Kavanagh, a Democrat of Troy, is expected to seek renomination for a new eight-year term, probably without opposition.

Democrats will nominate other candidates to run against Republican Justices Lawrence Lindemer of Stockbridge for a six-year term and James Ryan of Redford Township for a two-year term.

Lindemer was appointed by Gov. William Milliken to replace the late Thomas M. Kavanagh, and Ryan was picked to replace John B. Swainson, who resigned.

TWO STATE BOARD of Education vacancies will be up for grabs with the retirement of Democrat Marilyn Jean Kelly of Detroit and Republican appointee Gorton Riethmiller of Chelsea.

Seeking renomination to the University of Michigan Board of Regents will be Democrats Robert E. Nederlander, Birmingham lawyer, and Gerald Dunn, a lobbyist for nine area school districts.

On the Michigan State University Board of Trustees, the terms of Democrats Warren M. Huff of Plymouth and Dr. Blanche Martin of East Lansing are expiring. They have yet to announce whether they will seek renomination.

And on the Wayne State University Board of Governors, the terms of Democrats Augustus J. Calloway Jr. and George C. Edwards, both of Detroit, are expiring. They also have yet to reveal renomination plans.

The state convention will routinely confirm the nominations of 19 members of the Electoral College from their districts and nominate two more at-large. Typically, these nominations go to long-time party workers as a non-monetary reward for long service.

County lake boasts more fish

Belleville Lake in western Wayne County has surprisingly good fish populations, according to the state department of natural resources.

The Huron River impoundment was restocked in recent years after its existing population of rough fish had been killed off.

DNR fisheries crews made their surveys the week of July 21, using both nets and electroshocking techniques. The shock stuns fish long enough to allow a count but does no permanent damage, and the fish were all released after counting.

THE RESULTS showed:

•Bluegills—348 fish averaging 7 inches, with many 7½ to 8 inches. Most were spawning along the shore at Cemetery Point.

•Crappie—373 fish, averaging 7.6 inches, 83 per cent keeper size. They were fat and healthy.

•Smallmouth bass—19 fish averaging 9.8 inches; 47 per cent were 12-inch keepers.

•Northern pike—averaged 32 inches, with 20 inches being a keeper.

•Tiger muskellunge—three fish ranging from 30½ to 38 inches, with 30 inches being a keeper. Their condition was fat. The tiger muskie is a hybrid that eats more and grows faster than the standard muskie.

•Channel catfish—34 fish averaging 14.5 inches, all keepers (no minimum size limit). This was considered a good population.

•Walleye—64 fish, 17 per cent keeper size (15 inches). The 1975 plant already averages more than nine inches, the 1974 plant averages nearly 15 inches and a number of the 1973 plant are in the 18- to 22-inch class. Natural reproduction is occurring, and it looks like it will be a self-sustaining fishery.

Moderate numbers of carp are still in

the lake, but not enough to alarm biologists.

A continuing creel census indicates that more than 51,000 angler trips in 1976 have yielded more than 66,800 fish—or an average of 1.3 fish per angler per trip. A lot of people don't know the spots yet.

sky and summer insects is offered at the Kensington Metropark Nature Center at 9:30 p.m., Aug. 20.

Bring insect repellent and a flashlight.

PHEASANT HUNTERS should have more luck this year in the so-called "put-take" areas around Michigan. The state plans to release 120,000 birds, nearly double the 70,000 released for the 75 season.

Put-take hunting begins Aug. 16 at 16 lower peninsula locations and Sept. 15 at five other spots. Pheasant hunting stops with the Nov. 15-30 deer season, but the put-take season resumes afterwards and runs to Jan. 2.

To hunt in a put-take area, you need a special \$10 permit in addition to your small game license.

Nancy Dickerson, prominent national correspondent, reports for Detroit Edison:

Whatever you do to keep heat out of your house saves money in air conditioning. Window fans work, too.

Shades of the past.

Before you had air conditioning, there were things you did to keep comfortable, like pulling down the window shades and closing the draperies on the sunny side of the house. That's smart. Because a bare window lets in as much as 35 times more heat than an insulated wall.



So do the same now and you can reduce your air-conditioning costs by as much as 12 percent. Shade your windows from the outside with ventilated awnings or trees and save even more—up to 22 percent of your air-conditioning operating costs.

Maintain your cool.

If you want your air conditioner to take good care of you, keep it clean. This means changing or washing the air filters often. Also, vacuum the inside coils and keep outside coils free of debris. You can figure this out yourself. Just divide the BTU number by the number of watts. For example, a unit that delivers 6400 BTU's with 800 watts has an EER rating of 8. (800 goes into 6400 8 times.) The recommended EER number for any air conditioner is 8 or more. You may pay a little more, but you'll save on energy costs in the long run.

Regional roundup

GOOD MONEY MANAGEMENT

Garden City will receive \$216,988 in Title II Comprehensive Employment Training Act funds. This is \$27,000 more than expected by the city. Reason for the increase, which will mean additional hiring by the city, is that Garden City has demonstrated a competency in fiscal management. Joe Dvovich, federal grants coordinator, said the Office of Manpower has rated the city's CETA program "high."

CREW REUNITES

The surviving crew members of the final kamikaze attack of World War II held a reunion in Redford Township this week. The men were aboard the USS Borie, which was hit by a Japanese suicide pilot just five days before the end of the war. Thirty-four men were killed and many more wounded out of the original crew of 370 men. This is the 27th reunion, and the second time it has been held in the Detroit area.

MORE GUARD DEBATE

Plymouth Township officials and members of the Plymouth Community School Board met Monday to discuss funding of crossing guards with little success. Both held to their positions. Township officials maintain the schools should pay for the guards, while school officials think it is the

responsibility of the township. A "friendly court suit" may provide the answer to the problem.

BOND ISSUE SET

Wayne-Westland School District will seek a 0.4-mill increase for debt retirement when voters go to the polls Sept. 27. The increase would be used for repairing existing buildings and construction of a vocational-technical center.

COP ON TRIAL

A Detroit police officer accused of shooting a Redford man was bound over Tuesday to Wayne County Circuit Court by Redford Judge John Dillon. Paul Pranskaitis, free on \$10,000 bond, was charged with shooting George Janes while Pranskaitis was off duty. Dillon heard testimony from several persons who allegedly witnessed the shooting incident; one of them was the victim's mother, Mrs. June Janes.

CANTON OKS RESERVES

By the slimmest of margins, 4-3, the Canton Township Board of Trustees established a reserve police force Tuesday. The reserve force had been one of the hottest issues in the township during the primary campaign, as candidates argued the merits and pitfalls of the force. Supporters of the force were defeated in the primary. The reserves will take to the street as soon as liability insurance is paid.

VANDALISM

Another instance of random vandalism took place last weekend on the 2900 block of W. Chicago where approximately a dozen car windows were shattered by a BB gun and picture windows were pitted. Police have made no arrests.

MY OLD FLAIL

Threshing a load of rye grain with a 120-year-old flail is all in a day's work for Leigh Ryder, 92, of Livonia. The nonagenarian originally owned a 160-acre farm on the spot where Ford's Livonia Transmission Plant is located.

SIXTH FATALITY

Redford's sixth fatality was recorded Tuesday when Robert Davis, 18, was pronounced dead at Garden City Osteopathic Hospital. Davis was riding a motorcycle on Telegraph near Plymouth with a passenger when a taxi failed to yield the right of way, according to Redford police. The cab driver was ticketed; the passenger was treated and released. It was the sixth fatality of the year for Redford.

Presbyterian village offered Kresge grant

Presbyterian Village of Detroit, Inc., a retirement complex for the elderly, has been selected for a challenge grant of \$150,000 from The Kresge Foundation for the completion of the building of the new 64-bed Memorial Hall on its site at 17383 Garfield, in Redford Township.

Word of the grant was received recently in a letter from William H. Baldwin, president of the foundation.

Payment of the grant is subject to Presbyterian Village raising the balance of the funds required for the project. With this addition, and other buildings now being completed on this site, Presbyterian Village will have a potential population of 351 residents.

Presbyterian Village is an agency of the Presbytery of Detroit governed by a board of trustees elected from the geographic area it serves.

The area served encompasses all of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties and parts of Wahtenaw, Livingston and St. Clair counties. Its services include supervisory care for well-aged residents and nursing care for the infirm.

The Kresge Foundation, established in 1924 by Sebastian S. Kresge, is a private trustee corporation organized under the laws of the State of Michigan. Its stated purpose is to promote the well-being of mankind, and its Trustees are authorized to expend Foundation funds to this end.

Politicians' best-laid plans upset by voters

An extraordinarily unusual thing happened at the polls Aug. 3 when no one was paying much attention.

Wayne County voters nominated a man to county-wide office who hadn't first been appointed to the office and who hadn't been groomed for it by the previous officeholder. What's more, he hadn't even been endorsed by the AFL-CIO.

Raymond J. Wojtowicz, a one-time mayor of Hamtramck, was nominated for county treasurer on the Democratic ticket. For a candidate to come from nowhere, figuratively, and beat the machine is an extreme rarity.

WOJTOWICZ, whoever he is and whatever his other qualifications, defeated Clark G. Finley of Plymouth.

Finley had been deputy to the late Louis Funk, who as you recall pulled a fast one a couple of weeks before his death. Funk filed for re-election; so did deputy Finley, which seemed strange because a deputy rarely runs against his boss. At the last moment, Funk withdrew. Later he died.

The effect of Funk's maneuverings was to set up his deputy to succeed him, and it almost worked. Finley presented, on paper, as good a set of credentials as one could hope for. He is, at the moment and for the next few months, the man running the treasurer's office.

Enter Raymond J. Wojtowicz, hardly a household word and even less likely to become one.

Despite Finley's near-incumbency status, and despite the labor federation's endorsement of Finley, Wojtowicz beat him in the Democratic primary.

THE USUAL PATTERN is for a Wayne County officeholder to die or resign, to have his deputy

take over, and to have the deputy win election next time out.

The last three or four sheriffs have come in through appointment; ditto with the registers of deed (the current incumbent got the job when his 72-year-old father resigned in the middle of a four-year term); ditto with clerks and prosecutors and drain commissioners.

Until the entry of Raymond J. Wojtowicz on the county scene, no relative outsider had got a county-wide job other than through the appointment route in many, many years. And so the Aug. 3 primary for Wayne County treasurer qualifies as an extraordinarily unusual thing.

THE REAL QUESTION, however, is why the ballot needs to be cluttered with such posts as county treasurer, county clerk, county drain commissioner, county prosecutor, county sheriff and especially county auditors.

Essentially these are persons who don't make laws or policies or rules. They simply carry out legal duties.

Most voters can't name three-fourths of their countywide officeholders, let alone tell you anything about them. Even less do the voters have a method of telling whether those officeholders are doing a good job under the circumstances.

But let anyone suggest this array of 19th century elective posts be eliminated and replaced by (say) a county executive or manager—or better yet, a home rule charter—and the county officeholders are first in line, sometimes howling publicly, sometimes maneuvering behind the scenes, to put a stop to such reforms.

The whole system of electing county administrators is a gigantic farce. It ought to be abolished.

Candidates, issues, media failed to arouse the voters

Last week's primary election is now history. The winners have grinned in their victories, the losers have frowned in defeat, and the air is full of the sounds of the political pundits noisily sucking their prognosticating thumbs.

The big story of the election is not who won and who lost, but rather with the voters themselves. It all reminds me of the old radio commercial for Pepsodent: I wonder where the voters went. Voter turnout was not merely light; it floated into the sky, lighter than air.

Statewide, unofficially less than one-quarter of the registered voters bothered to go to the polls, a record low for an August primary election.

THINGS WERE little better in these suburbs. Only 19 per cent of the registered voters in Avon Township turned out, leading Clerk Thelma Spencer to say, "I can't remember when a turnout has been this poor."

Farmington Hills registered a 19.5 per cent turnout (versus 42.7 per cent for the May primary), while the City of Farmington weighed in with 26 per cent (versus 49.2 per cent in May); both figures were the worst in history for both cities.

Livonia voters, despite the presence on the ticket of home towners Marvin Stempin in the 2d District congressional race, only turned out at a 22 per cent clip, fully 10 points under City Clerk Addison Bacon's prediction. Garden City (18 per cent), Southfield (27 per cent), and the City of Plymouth (25 per cent) also contributed uninspiring voter performance.

NOT SURPRISINGLY voter turnout was highest in those suburbs where a hot contest seized the minds of the people.

In Canton Township, where incumbent Supervisor Robert Greenstein lost his primary bid to Howard Stein in a hotly (and dirtily) contested campaign, voters turned out at a 35 per cent clip.

Politics in Redford Township, always volatile, produced a big race over the township clerk office. Incumbent Ruth Sullivan survived bitter attacks from challengers Earl Patchett and Louise Laurila. Voters responded with a 32 per cent turnout.

Plymouth Township has a new favorite for supervisor, local Realtor Tom Notebaert; the race drew out 37 per cent of the registered voters.

IN LIGHT of these generally poor voter participation figures, lots of weighty generalizations are being thrown out as explanations. Watergate. Suspicion of government generally. Alienation of the electorate.

The Detroit daily newspapers called it a dull campaign, conveniently forgetting that it was their own coverage that made it that way. The local television stations went the same way. On

the other hand, most candidates I talked to said they were having a terrible time getting news play.

Where it all ends up, I suspect, is that a lot of people did stay at home because they saw no reason to go out and vote. In some cases, campaigns were dull because the issue was never in doubt; in other cases, candidates failed to get their issues across to the voters; in some cases, the media did a poor job.

But where the campaigns were alive and where the issues were salient, the voters turned out. This is the way it always has been, and I suspect this is the way things are likely to be in the future.

American democracy is not dead in these suburbs; it's there, just as it always has been. All it needs is good candidates, debating the issues frankly, with adequate coverage from the media.

I just hope all three elements will perform better this fall.

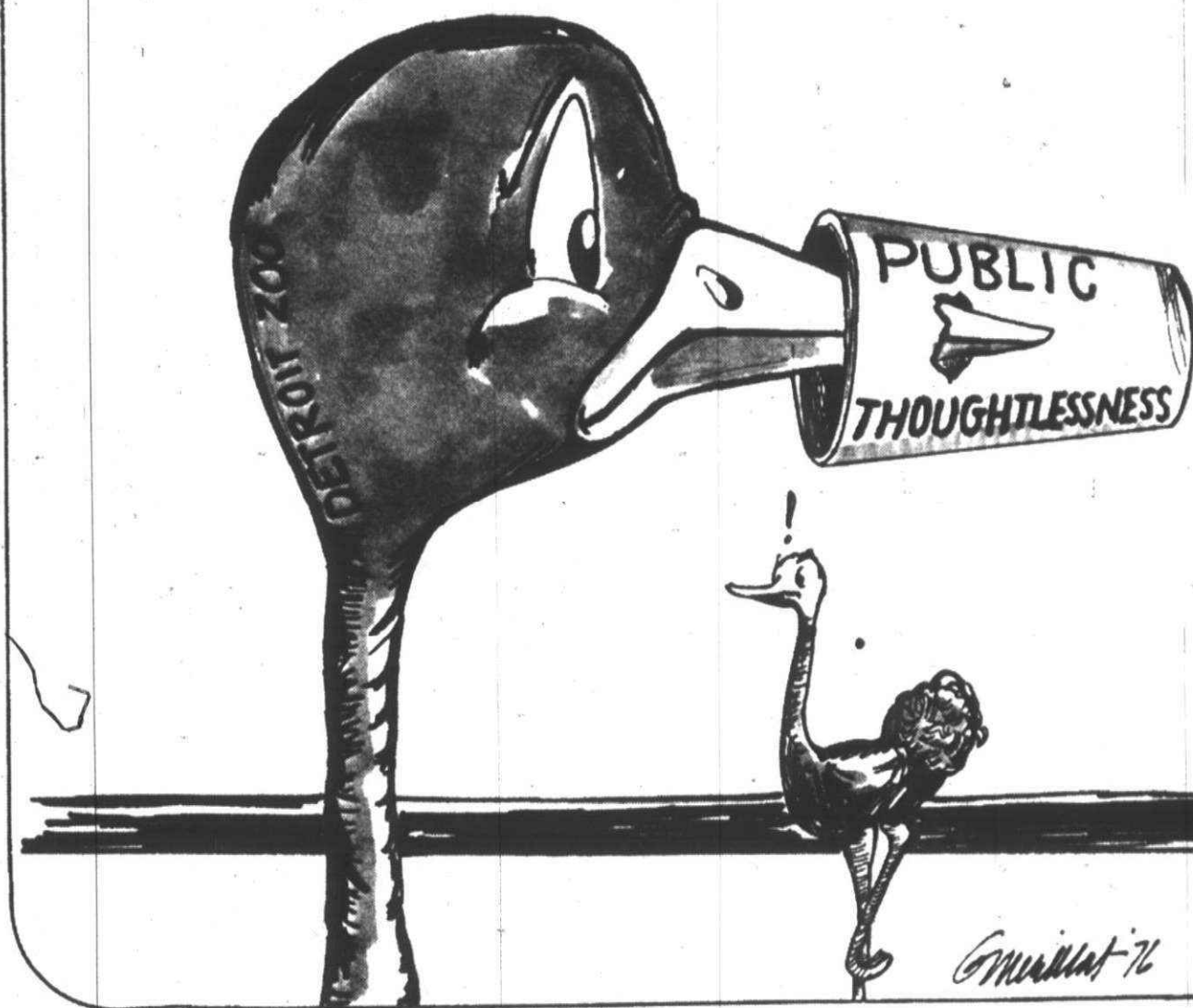

Zoo news: More trash, but suburban groups help

There are a couple of things new at the Detroit Zoological Park, which, as every one knows, isn't in Detroit at all but two miles north in Oakland County.

One is that the litter explosion has hit the beloved zoo. Some say the zoo's maintenance has gone to pot, but I'm more inclined to think it's part of the trend toward trashing that has infected public facilities everywhere in the past three years.

The management has placed no-littering signs everywhere, but the situation is deteriorating. Although the ostrich is a dumb-looking bird, it was pathetic to see one try to shed the Styrofoam coffee cup it had stuck its beak through.

The monkeys are smarter and ignore the corn chips and junk foods people toss them.

THE OTHER new thing is the overwhelming numbers of suburban schools and groups which are "adopting" animals by raising the cost of feeding them for a year.

Not all the persons making contributions are identified by community, but where identifications are possible, it seems that suburban groups are lining up to support the zoo by a margin of 7-1 compared to Detroiters.

Bloomfield Hills Junior High and Gallimore school of Plymouth have adopted giraffes. Bot-sford school of the Clarenceville district, the WHW Club of Inkster and groups from Huntington Woods, Utica and Richmond have adopted aoudad monkeys.

Redford Union High School is supporting Jim-Jim the Gorilla; Channel 7 in Southfield has adopted another gorilla.

Detroit Diesel Engineering—which everyone knows is in Redford Township, not Detroit—and the Dearborn Holiday Inn are the food supplies for monkeys.

Llamas have been adopted by Volney Smith school of Redford Township. Franklin school of Birmingham, Plymouth C.O. Peck 860 and such non-metropolitan groups as Pinckney High, Owosso High and Brownie Troop 151 of Saline.

Oh, there were Detroit organizations represented—Lingeman school for a crane, Region 7 Middle School for a bushbuck, Greenfield Park Elementary for Jo Mendi II and Roosevelt school for a monkey.

BUT THE OVERWHELMING impression was that it was groups and businesses from all over southeast Michigan, and not Detroit groups and businesses, that were kicking in funds to help feed and preserve the animals.

Our auto licenses are issued at random, so it's impossible now to do a random plate survey to see where zoo patrons hail from.

An enlightened but unfortunately unaggressive group called Regional Citizens did a member survey on the institutions of southeast Michigan which should be considered for some kind of regional or state funding. The zoo came in second only to the Institute of Arts and ahead of the historical museums, the Detroit Symphony, Channel 56, the Science Center, Belle Isle, the Freedom Festival and suchlike.

The zoo's official history, "The First Fifty Years," published in 1974, gave this breakdown of revenues: Refectory (food stand) sales, 38 per cent; admissions, 12 per cent; taxes (no breakdown), 28 per cent; parking, the railroad and miscellaneous fees, 22 per cent.

IT'S PRETTY CLEAR suburbanites and out-staters are being smeared with a bum rap when certain politicians profess to see a "hate-Detroit" attitude here.

And it's also clear suburbanites endorse, at least implicitly, the notion that they have a responsibility to help support the zoo. For even when they're paying to feed animals, suburbanites are easing the pressure on Detroit's city budget and enabling the city to divert money into wages, which make up 68 per cent of the zoo's budget.

Now if only Detroit abandon its vicious policy of hiring "residents only"

bridge itself is only a single-lane, plank bridge set at an angle, so even a sober driver in broad daylight would have trouble negotiating it. There are no guardrails, so that anyone coming from the bridge at any rate of speed could end up in the drink.

What was more interesting were the comments of the natives of Chappaquiddick Island. They have their own theory about what happened on that fateful night of the Edgartown Regatta.

They claim that Teddy Kennedy was driving down the road with a girl. Later, another woman's purse was found in the car.

THEY SURMISE that Mary Jo Kopechne had fallen asleep in the back seat of the car, and neither Teddy nor the lady with him was aware of her presence. They also surmise that when his car left the road and hit the water, he did, in fact, get his companion out of the car and the two walked back two miles to the cottage where their party had been going on.

Within 50 yards of the scene of the accident, there is a cottage which, that night, had its lights on. The local people feel that no human being—no matter how ambitious for further public office—

would walk away from a situation where a person could be dying and bypass the opportunity to get help.

They then surmise that the whole group attending the party realized Mary Jo was missing and they went, en masse, back to the scene to see if she was in the submerged car.

When they were either unable to find her or get her out, they went their separate ways, not knowing what was in store for them the next morning.

This is much more logical because the story, as told over and over again by the people involved, makes the senator from Massachusetts appear to be a cold-blooded, ambitious and callous individual.

PEOPLE SAY that if the events of Chappaquiddick were to happen today, the echoes of Watergate would force complete disclosure.

There are certainly elements of coverup by the local district attorney and the friends of Teddy Kennedy.

But besides the loss of the life of a young woman, a tragedy of Chappaquiddick is that if someone in public office had been willing to tell the truth, in time the public would probably have forgiven him.

The fact that he used the influence of his office and of his family's name actually blew the situation out of proportion, damaging him far more than the actual events indicated he deserved.

However, Chappaquiddick has not hurt Teddy Kennedy in Massachusetts. He will probably be re-elected to office this fall with the biggest majority he has ever had.

Intermediate district in new building

The Wayne County Intermediate School District has moved into its first permanent home at Van Born and Howe roads in the City of Wayne.

The new building, costing \$5.3 million, has approximately 95,000 square feet of

space for 180 of the intermediate district's 1,100 employees.

There is an auditorium seating 200 and several smaller conference rooms, as well as work areas for teachers. A well-equipped resource center will provide all types of educational aids to local school districts for the cost of materials.

The intermediate district's data processing center has been housed in the new building since January. It is used by 25 of the 36 local school districts for payroll, attendance, student scheduling, inventory, test scoring and computer-assisted instruction.

There is also an extensive reference service which will research and reproduce information on any phase of education.

THE NEW building is on a 30-acre site adjoining the Wayne County Federated Library System. A portion of the site was purchased from Wayne County in 1971. An additional section containing five homes was purchased later. The total cost for the site, including clearing and development, was \$225,000.

The move to new quarters will save the intermediate district more than \$132,000 in rents it now pays for office space in downtown Detroit, Westwood, Wayne and Lincoln Park. The new center was financed by a bond issue being retired by a county tax levy of 0.06 mills (six cents for every \$1,000 of state equalized property valuation).

For many years, the county school office were located in Detroit's City-County Building but demands by county and city agencies for additional space forced the intermediate district to move to rented quarters.

THE WAYNE County Intermediate School District is supported by state funds and by 0.03 mills from the 15-mill county tax. Income from state and local sources is about \$4 million a year. The district disburses an additional \$35 million for specially funded state and local projects to local districts. A one-mill special education tax, which raises \$14 million annually, is also passed on to local districts.

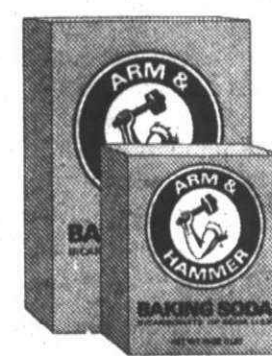

Disparities in juvenile homes aired

America's juvenile corrections facilities are clogged with kids who can't get along with their parents—who skipped school, broke curfew or ran away from home.

More than one-third of the 1,837 youth in correctional programs sampled by the National Assessment of Juvenile Corrections (NAJC) were "status offenders," including nearly one-third of those in closed institutions. Many are confined side-by-side with youth who have committed arson, assault or armed robbery. A status offense is one that would not be considered a crime if committed by an adult.

For girls, who typically commit the less serious offenses, the percentage is even greater, according to University of Michigan social work Prof. Robert D. Vinter, co-director of the U-M-based study.

"In addition, minority youth—especially blacks—are assigned to correctional programs far out of proportion to their numbers in the general population. Minority persons and females are underrepresented however," he added, "among administrators and program staff."

The latest NAJC report, "Time Out: A National Study of Juvenile Correctional Programs," edited by Vinter with Theodore M. Newcomb and Rhea K. Kish, outlines the disparities in programs and policies within and among the states. Newcomb is U-M professor emeritus of sociology and psychology, and Kish is NAJC administrative associate.

THE NAJC PROJECT, begun in 1971 under a grant from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration of the U.S. Department of Justice, is the first comprehensive collection of national data on juvenile correctional programs.

Analyzing a wide range of institutions, group homes and non-residential treatment centers, the current report focuses on the youth, the staff, and their view of the existing programs.

"The typical NAJC youth is likely to be a male, non-white, about 16 years of age and lower class," the authors stated. "He is no angel—he readily admits to drinking, using drugs and skipping school, but neither is he a hardened criminal."

"He has probably committed a minor property crime, (although if female, it was likely a status offense). Male or female, the typical youth in the study has had considerable prior contact with the juvenile justice system."

THE U-M RESEARCHERS found little similarity among the youth grouped in a specific program, however. In most cases they varied in age, race, and the nature of offense.

"The institutions, considered the most severe corrections alternative, contained the largest proportion of serious offenders," the NAJC found. "But nearly a third of their populations were status offenders—persons whose conduct would not be considered a crime if committed by an adult."

"On the other hand, we were encouraged to find persons with serious offense histories being successfully handled by the more open and flexible group homes and day treatment centers, without any marked concerns about misconduct or maintenance of order."

While the NAJC was not charged to evaluate the programs it surveyed, it evinces a strong preference for group home and day treatment alternatives. Highly structured, isolated and costly to operate, the institutions tend to exert more control over their charges, the U-M researchers found. Three-fourths of the institutions sampled has a discipline unit or access to one, compared with only one-third of the group homes or day treatment centers.

THE STAFF MEMBERS NAJC interviewed in each of the three types of programs were very similar: they tended to be in their early 30's, with 75 per cent white, and 60 per cent male. About half have a college degree and more than five years of experience with children. Institutional staff range among the oldest, less educated and most experienced in the corrections field.

Different staff groups placed different emphasis on such objectives as "having a close relationship with the youth," providing remedial education and "maintaining discipline." But staff and executives of all programs ranked "treatment" above "custody," "community interaction" and other objectives as their preferred goal.

Some 1,300 institutional youth were also questioned in the study, and their responses offered some striking comparisons between "newcomers" who had entered the program within the past four months and "veterans" who had been confined a year or more.

The percentage reporting offenses such as fighting, stealing or hitting a staff member increased steadily with the length of stay in the institution. Only 20 per cent of the newcomers, but 46 per cent of the veterans, say that since their arrival they have learned "many ways" to break the law. "Being a veteran in a predominantly veteran program is the most detrimental combination of circumstances," the NAJC concluded. "The more 'hardened' a youth becomes after entering, the longer he or she is likely to stay. Our data suggest that the cause of this vicious circle is not the facility or its staff, but the youths' influence upon one another."

THESE FINDINGS further support the NAJC's call for the removal of status offenders from juvenile institutions. In fact, the U-M researchers strongly urged "major cutbacks in the numbers and sizes of closed institutions in almost every state."

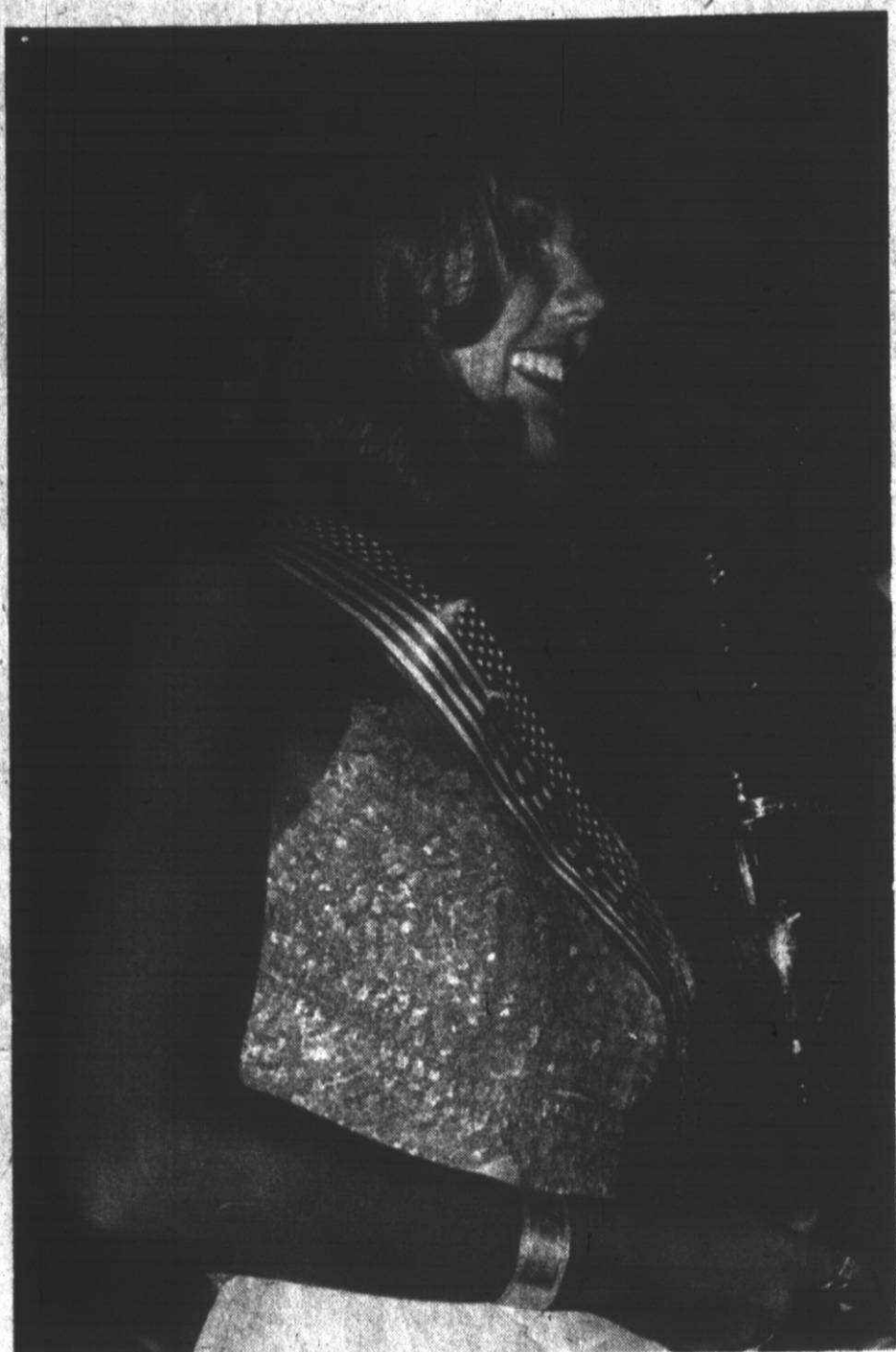

"It's fun to get up on a stage and do something. If they (the chorale) needed someone for a young role, I was it. I sang with them and I helped backstage," the petite blond said.

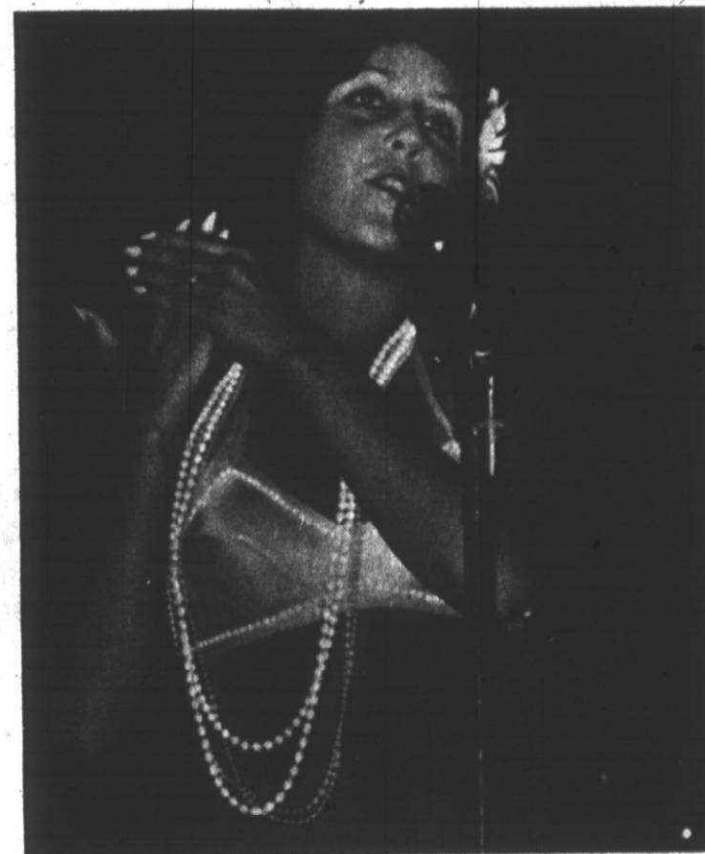
She's been studying dance, ballet, tap and Hawaiian, since the age of five, and hopes to be a photographer's model and do television commercials.

New book out

Gundella doesn't find ghosts in graveyards

"Detroit's just as spooky as London or New Orleans," said Gundella the witch, who has a love affair with the metropolitan area.

There's a connection: What makes ghosts is people. And what makes metropolitan Detroit fascinating is people, said the witch from Garden City.

Gundella makes her case in her new book, "The Werewolf of Grosse Pointe and Other Stories," which is scheduled to be in bookstores any day. "Werewolf" (\$1.95 in paperback, Earsight Productions, 120 pages) contains 25 stories and myths, all of a nature at least slightly spooky.

ONE STORY takes place in a church yard in Farmington. It was related to Gundella by a local resident because it actually happened to him. That story first appeared in her column in Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

"Some go back to Indian legends, like the snake goddess of Belle Isle," said Gundella, bubbling.

"Another is the Red Dwarf—Nain Rouge," she said. "The most recent sighting of the dwarf was March 1 of this year by a Detroit Edison lineman."

Other stories occur at Peche Isle in the Detroit River, the Sister Islands in Lake Erie, the site of the Renaissance Center in downtown Detroit, L'Anse Creuse (now St. Clair Shores), Mount Clemens, Lincoln Park, the Rosedale Park section of northwest Detroit, Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti and River Rouge.

The characters range from Indians to modern artists, French ribbon farmers to just plain homeowners.

THEY DON'T occur in graveyards.

"That's the least likely place to find a ghost," Gundella said, eyes glowing. "If I ghost haunts, it's because he wants to communicate, and who's it going to communicate with in a graveyard?"

"If anyone sees a ghost and it isn't a figment of their imagination, it's because the ghost wants to communicate or doesn't know it's dead."

"Werewolf" is Gundella's first book of this sort, although in her 22 years as a school teacher, she has written children's books and teacher manuals.

Sociologist Marcello Truzzi, Eastern Michigan University specialist in the study of witchcraft, wrote the book's introduction. He calls it "an important contribution to regional and urban folklore."

"THE WAY I happened to write the book," Gundella said, "is that I've always been interested in folklore. The story about idols at the Renaissance Center—that was in my history book in third grade in Tawas."

Roman Babiak, head of Earsight Productions, once suggested that Gundella lead a ghost tour of New Orleans and lamented it was too bad there couldn't be such a tour of the Detroit area.

"I said I could write a book!" Gundella responded. "He said, 'Do it,' and I had it done in two months."

She had collected the material over the years. Some tales were from letters in response to her columns; others were scattered in history books; others she had learned from interviewing the elderly in the days when she was a social worker.

WHAT MAKES the Detroit area a tremendous place for ghost stories, she said, is not only the people but the rivers and lakes.

"Many of these stories occur on the banks of the river. The Detroit River is a transportation link with the world. It's also a link with the spirit world." Her hands rolled through the air like fog.

With such assets, Detroit is in the same ballpark with London and New Orleans as a scene for ghost stories.

Her love affair with Detroit—Gundella uses the name loosely to designate the tri-county metropolitan area—began on her high school senior trip to the city at the age of 16.

In 1948, she arrived here as a fledgling teacher in the downriver area and, except for one spell of a few months, has lived in the area ever since.

Her love of writing and ability to handle the English language date back to when she was a 35-cents-an-hour "printer's devil" (you should pardon the jargon of the trade) for a little old lady who owned the Tozco County weekly paper.

"And I admired an English teacher at Central Michigan University. He sang folk songs and got an idea for a folk song story tour," Gundella said.

"IF THIS BOOK is successful," she went on, "I'd like to do one on the ghosts of Michigan."

That won't be a two-months project, however, because it will mean some story collecting from scratch.

Gundella has one suggestion for reading her book:

"Read it not just to yourself but aloud at your next party. Then get the others to tell their own stories."

"Pretty soon you'll find the person you least expect will come up with the most amazing—!"

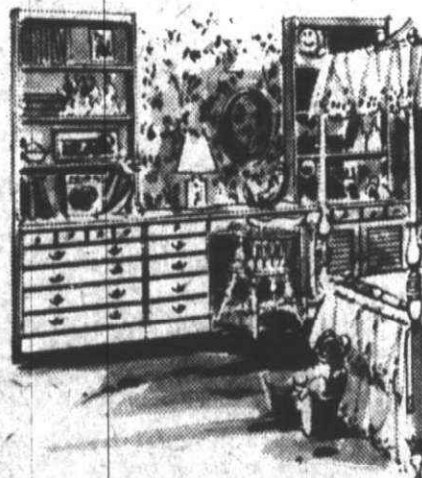

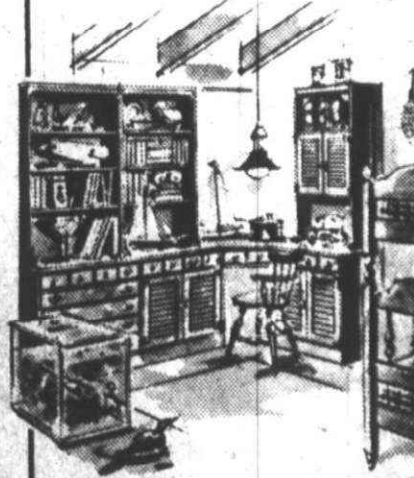

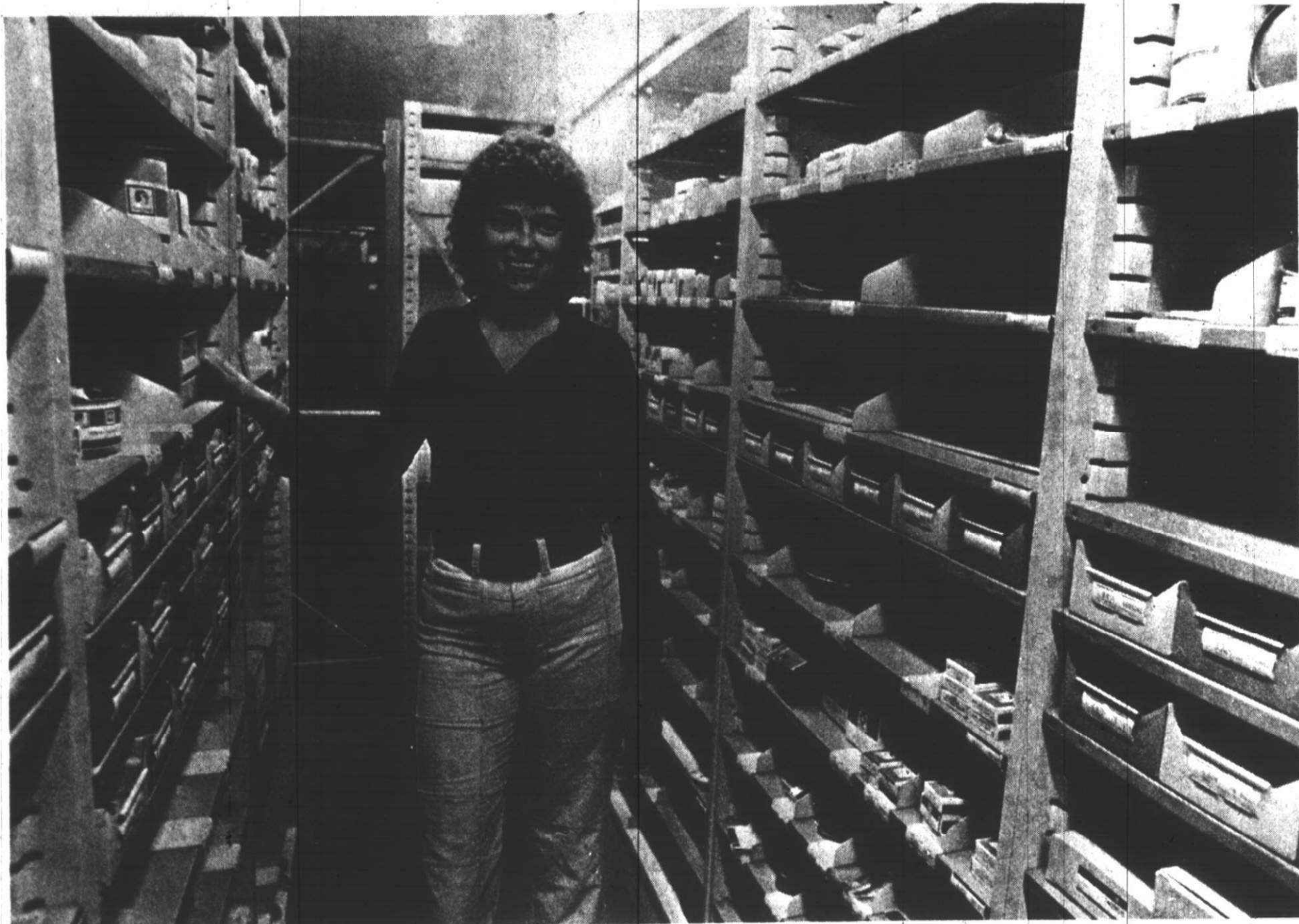

Plymouth woman knows car parts

A young woman who says she was "driving something with a motor and four wheels since the time I was 6" is now one of the few female car parts managers in Michigan. She works for Bob Saks Olds handling a \$200,000 monthly inventory.

Nancy Smith, who grew up in the country north of Battle Creek, marks the beginnings of her career at 17 when she couldn't get a job after high school graduation.

She was offered a free course in foreign car repair and took it to "fill up the time." That led to her first job as a car mechanic. That was in 1966, before the advent of "The Feminine Mystique." Women's liberation and NOW.

"It took a lot of nerve for him (the owner) to give me that chance. The same kind of daring it must have taken for Mr. Saks when he moved me from assistant manager to manager," she said.

Of her boss, she says, "He's a good guy to work for. He lets the managers manage."

INTERIM JOBS found her driving courtesy cars, working as a service writer, working as a pit mechanic and singing in a rock and roll band.

Mrs. Smith earned her living for two years as a singer, which she refers to as "a competitive art form and not the most secure business in the world."

Bringing four people together to render a creative offering is a far cry from bringing many times that many together to render a specific service, she explained.

She has hired the majority of her own crew of seven who work out of the Farmington dealer's lot on Grand River.

"My crew is young, but they perform and that's all that counts," she said.

Her young crew and Saks' daring apparently paid off because last February Mrs. Smith was named manager of the month stemming from a high in sales of \$91,000,

about \$30,000 higher than could be expected for a February.

HER FEELINGS about this is that she is selling a service, and parts are but a by-product of that service. She followed up this feeling by rattling off a string of instances where members of her crew would be sent to as far away as Howell or Lansing in order to give one-day service.

"If a part is tying up a car for someone, we'll do it. We do it constantly. We're going to be her next year and for years after that. It doesn't make much sense not to do a good job for our customers," she said.

She suspects she works an average of 11 hours a day, often takes work home with her "but that is necessary to do the job. It comes with the territory," she says.

The service she renders, she believes, goes hand in hand with that of the service mechanic, whom she calls a trained technician.

"We don't have a heavy turnover at all of the men who service the cars and they are constantly being sent out to the GM Tech Center just to keep up. A tune-up used to be a simple operation, but cars are getting so complicated now, all part of our complicated society. I guess. Basic inventory is just not what it used to be," she said.

"A dealership just keeps playing catch-up with supply and demand and it seems everybody wants all the goodies they can load onto a car. Selling a basic car is practically unheard of. Most of the cars sold here are sold fully loaded and that means more switches and nuts and bolts for me."

Keeping all of the switches and nuts and bolts in their proper place comes easy for her because "I like things in order. I like things to be where they're supposed to be," she said.

Mrs. Smith lives in Plymouth with her husband Dan who is drummer for the Tom Powers Trio now playing at the Peppermill.

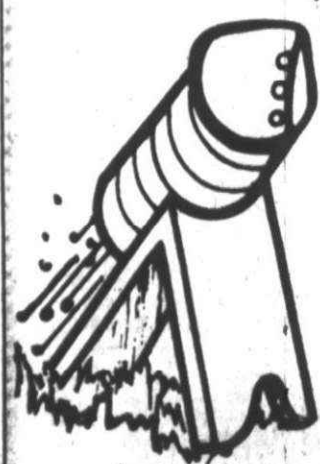

English Synod sets up shop in Livonia

The new English Synod, a Lutheran organization that may eventually include many congregations across the country that have found themselves in conflict with the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, currently is a home in Livonia.

The building housing the denomination is the former parsonage next door to Faith Lutheran Church, 30000 Five Mile.

And when the Rev. Harold Hecht and his secretary moved in last month, deserting their former headquarters at 23001 Grand River in Detroit, it marked one more step in the long dispute over doctrine that has rocked the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in recent years.

A final step, said Mr. Hecht, who had just come from a convention at River Forest, Ill., in which the English District of the synod had voted to begin dissolution of its ties with the parent organization and revert to the independent synod status it had known before 1911.

"I feel the battling is over and we can get on with our work," he said in the vacated parsonage that will house the split-off organization for now.

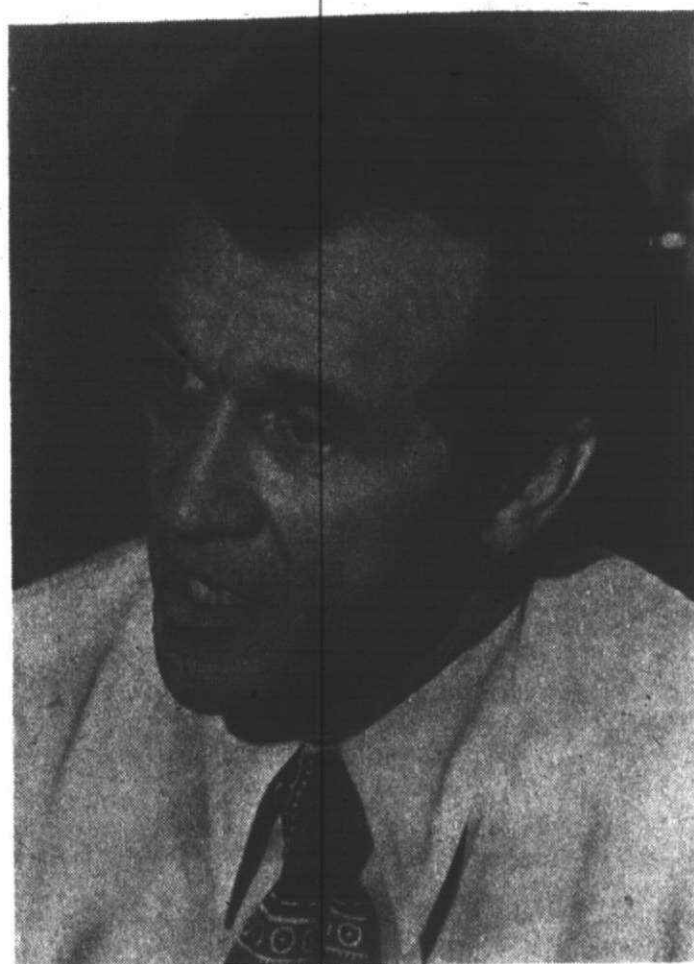
"Now," he added, "it becomes the great concern of every congregation to come to grips with the issue and decide on its future affiliation."

THE MOVE TO LIVONIA, he said, came at the invitation of the board of trustees of Faith Church, one of three Livonia congregations that had moved earlier this year to leave the Michigan district of the LCMS and affiliate with the more liberal English district.

The parsonage was available because Faith's associate pastor was leaving. The invitation, said Mr. Hecht, "made me feel God really provides."

"I had gone to the convention knowing I would have to resign," explained the clergyman. He had been president and executive officer of the English district but was removed from office April 2 in a dispute over ordinations.

"I really didn't know where the office was going to go. The vote to seek independent status was 296 to 75, and electing to stay with the Missouri Synod were one vice-president and one member of the board of directors, so the district is continuing."

"Other are taking over in our office in Detroit, but we can begin the work of the new synod from here."

THE FIRST STEP, said Mr. Hecht, who for the present is serving without salary, will be determining which of the 227 Lutheran congregations that had comprised the English District will become part of the new English Synod.

"Some will not," Mr. Hecht said, "either through inertia or because they prefer the more conservative doctrine that has dominated the Missouri Synod under its current president, Dr. J. A. O. Preus."

"But delegates from three congregations indicated at the time of the convention they had made the decision to separate no

matter what happened at that meeting, and we expect many more will do the same."

The Rev. Roger Schleef, pastor of Faith in Livonia, said his congregation would meet early in the fall to make a decision on its future affiliation.

"We had a strong majority when we voted to affiliate with the English District, and our board voted unanimously to rent the parsonage to the English Synod," he said, "so that may well be indicative of the feeling at Faith."

FOLLOWING the convention, Mr. Hecht said, a booklet was prepared by the English Synod, outlining the reasons for the decision to leave the Missouri Synod and the

steps for congregations to follow in involving themselves with the new group.

This booklet is now being distributed, he said.

It explains reasons for the action of convention, going into the dispute that has involved the firing of a president of Concordia College in St. Louis, Mo., because he was accused of approving the teaching of false doctrine, and the subsequent formation of a Seminary in Exile, or Sem-nex.

It was the matter of ordaining graduates of Seminex that led to the removal from office of Mr. Hecht and several other district presidents.

Also included in the book is a history of the group of churches that in 1911 was known as the English Synod, different from Missouri Synod churches in that they used the English language rather than German.

These churches tended to have a somewhat more liberal view from a doctrinal standpoint, even after becoming part of the Missouri Synod 75 years ago.

It was this difference that made the synod a central part of the doctrinal dispute that began after Preus took office, and in the last couple of years it has received a number of congregations formerly in geographical districts, including three in Livonia—Faith, Holy Trinity and All-Saints.

THE DISPUTE in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod is a doctrinal one, Mr. Hecht said.

"I've heard the comment that we are Bible-doubters and that the dispute is over such matters as whether one should believe literally that Jonah lived inside that whale," he said.

"I've never known a Bible-doubter. There would not be a split over a small matter like the story of Jonah."

"The point worth splitting over is our belief that the word of God is supreme. The Bible needs interpretation and the individual must find his own understanding of the Holy Spirit."

"We cannot accept limiting interpretation and understanding with Dr. Preus' 'Statement of Scriptural and Confessional Principles' and directives from the Missouri Synod."

He pointed to a paragraph in the new English Synod book listing as one of the

reasons for separation the fact that "the theology of 'A Statement of Scriptural and Confessional Principles' continues to dominate the Missouri Synod."

The book states that the statement "is non-Lutheran and borders on non-Christian because it established criteria other than faith in Christ for salvation—dangerously close to suggesting that faith in the Bible is essential for salvation."

MR. HECHT said the new synod probably will stay in the Detroit area, where he owns a home, and will concentrate membership development in the Great Lakes area and Canada, while also welcoming English District congregations from all over the country and congregations from the Michigan and other geographical districts.

"An important part of our program," he added, "will be seeking to be in fellowship with other Lutheran churches, those in the American Lutheran Church and the Lutheran Church in America."

"We'll have a convention later this year and, unlike recent Missouri Synod conventions, it will be a joyful one. There will be a small amount of business and then celebration. We have a lot to celebrate."

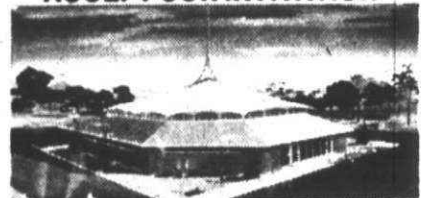

Family life is changing

Maintaining the "Biblical" family in an age when such a unit is becoming a "defunct institution" in America can be one way of preventing further erosion of American society, says a Michigan State University professor.

"We're at a crossroads in America," curriculum research specialist Ted Ward feels. "U.S. political events have demonstrated our potential for becoming a nation of slippery values, and we can keep slipping or recognize the alternatives of Biblical values."

The professor of education explained

that a Biblical family, valued by Christians, consists of parents who regard marriage as a lifelong bond and who regard children as a responsibility not a nuisance.

"Research has suggested that this kind of unit plays a vital part in teaching moral values," he noted. "The family is the building block of society, and even one family can make a difference. I see no effective substitute for the family as the center of moral development for the child."

DR. WARD OBSERVED that American secular society is moving more toward

"fluid marriages" not expected to last a lifetime with less parental responsibility for childrearing.

"Our society is providing more and more elaborate ways to make the schools responsible for providing for children's health and nutrition, determining what kind of learning is vital and defining their goals and values," he said.

"When the schools take over responsibilities that were formerly family responsibilities, it's unlikely the family will resume them again," he added.

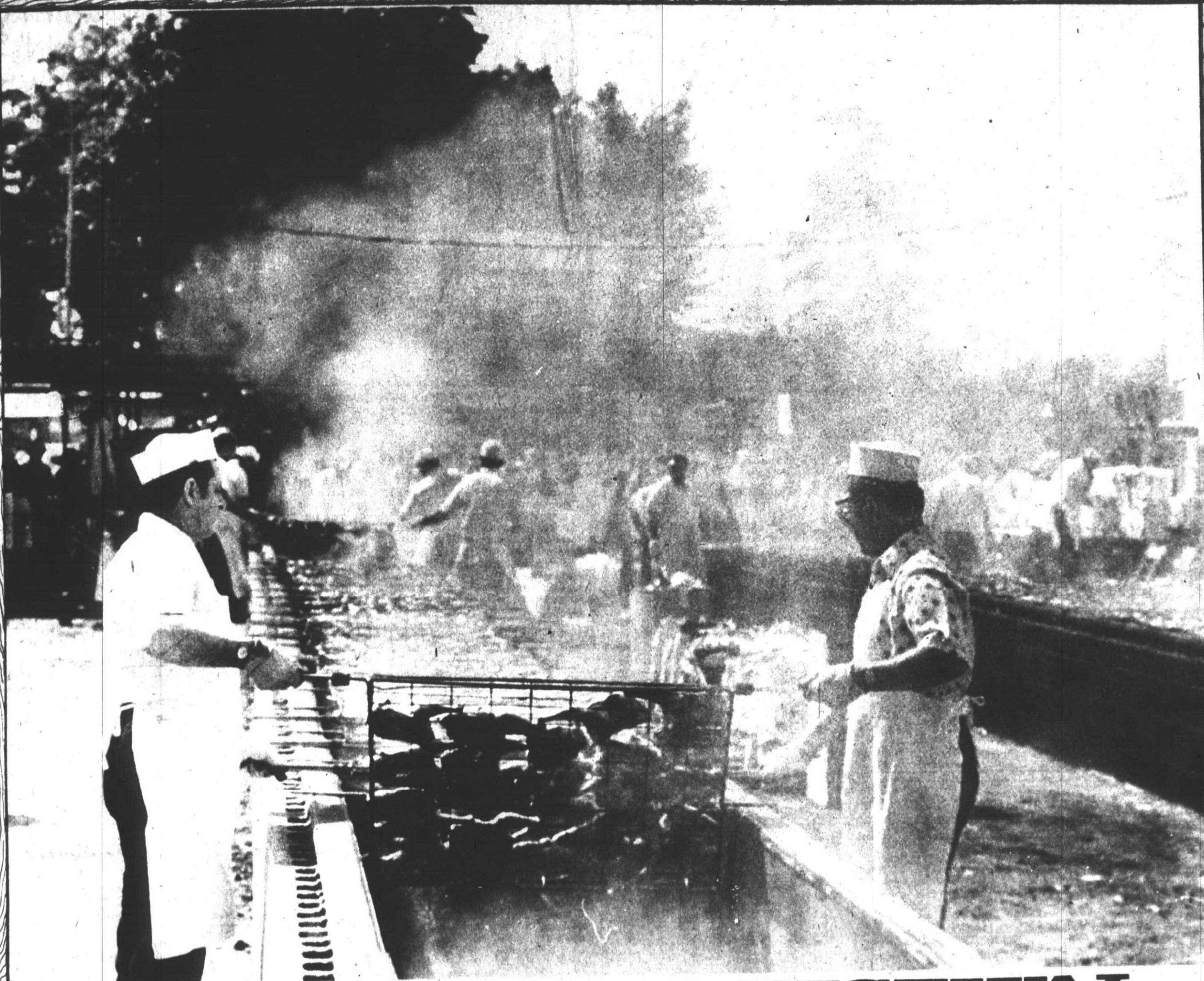

Evans broke flight record in 1926

(Part Two of a three-part series)
Edward S. Evans, the founder of Evans Products Company, had a flare for the dramatic. A firm believer in research, he backed a foundation which was exploring the potential of shipping freight by air.
To dramatize this project—he invited federal officials to Detroit where he staged a luncheon to which vine-ripened fruits and vegetables were flown.
They arrived by eight air lines from five countries on two continents, within six to 36 hours after the produce had been picked.
But Evans, the astute businessman who knew how to make a buck, had another side to his nature. The astute pragmatist was also an adventurer at heart. The realist, the supereleman, the dignified indus-

trial leader (he was called Mister, or Colonel by all except a few intimates) was also a romanticist.
During his boyhood in Virginia he had been told he was a descendant of Mary, Queen of Scots. When searching for someone to liken him to, the names of Frances Drake or Walter Raleigh come more readily to mind.
HE WAS A member of the Adventurer's Club of Chicago, and a Fellow of the American Geographical Society. He managed two airplane expeditions to the Arctic for Sir Hubert Wilkins, and one for the University of Michigan.
He was a former assistant librarian for Congress; a believer in graphology who refused to hire a man without seeing a



sample of his handwriting; and a writer of Eddie Guest-type poetry expressing his love of nature and beauty.
It was this imaginative, idealistic romantic in Evans which took over once a year, propelling his prosaic counterpart into daring vacations against the advice of his family and business associates.
One summer, on one of what he called his "vacation stunts," Evans and Austin Bement, head of a Detroit advertising agency, drove a car over Carroll Summit, Nevada, where the grade was so steep, the wheels of the auto had to be locked and the car slid down the hill.
It was more than a lark. The Lincoln Highway, which Evans was promoting, later followed the same route westward.
In the summer of 1924, again with Bement, Evans took off on the first automobile trip ever made from Winnipeg, Manitoba, to Victoria, B.C.
No trick today, of course, but in 1924, there was no highway to drive over.

AT ONE POINT, they could go no further because of a 1,000 foot gorge along the Frazier River Canyon. A single track of the Canadian National Railroad passed along the edge of the canyon through 19 tunnels and over 15 trestles.
Evans drove the auto through all of the tunnels and over all of the trestles. Before he did, however, he commissioned a blacksmith to transfer steel-flanged wheels from a railroad hand car to his automobile.
[That was the beginning of the Evans "auto railer" which Evans introduced 12 years later—a hybrid vehicle equipped with rubber tires for highway use, and retractable steel wheels for use on railroad tracks. The U.S. armed forces made good use of the "auto railer" during the Korean War.

Evans went on his most spectacular vacation in the summer of 1926. The venture grew out of another of his business crusades—an effort to sell America on the use of commercial airlines.
He teamed up with a newspaper corre-

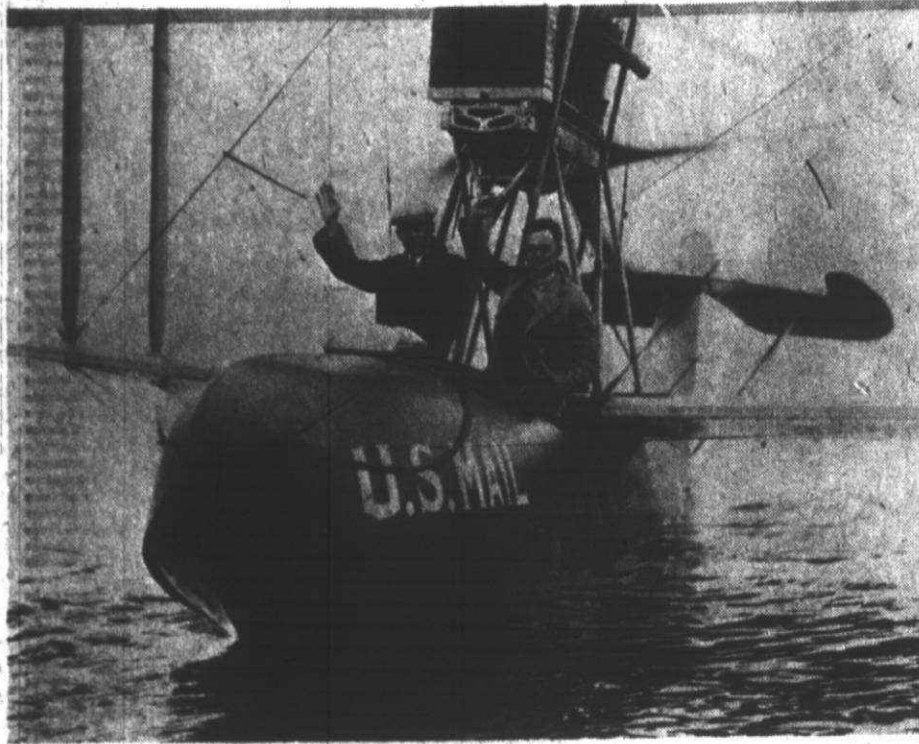

spondent, Linton Wells, in an attempt to break the record a trip around the world.
Leaving the World Building in New York City on June 16, they raced around the globe in 28 days, 14 hours, and 36 minutes, establishing a new record.
Wells cabled the newspapers at each step of the flight and later wrote a book about the exploit.
Not much in the way of literature, "Around the World in Twenty Eight Days" received mixed reviews.
The critic for the New York Times said it was "a thrilling book, and the feat it describes was of no little consequence."
The Herald Tribune book critic, less charitably, called it "a very journalistic account of a publicity stunt." The book is primarily of interest because it shows the hardships Evans was willing to endure in his quest for adventure and to demonstrate an idea—in this case his faith in the airplane as a reliable carrier.

CROSSING THE Atlantic on the Aquitania, Evans and Wells flew over Europe and Asia in open cockpit planes even more primitive than the one made immortal by another Detroit, Charles Lindbergh, who

made his non-stop flight over the Atlantic in the following spring.
Their shivers in the open plane were partly from the cold and partly from fear that they might not find their destination during night flights, which were unusual in those days.
Their pilot could not locate one of the airfields until Very pistols were fired from the ground "where scores of men were in position with flares to form a horizon and simplify the landing."
They met with a friendly reception in Russia, but were held up until Soviet officials inspected every possible hiding place in the plane.
The Russians even drained the gas tanks and took soundings to determine whether there was any contraband aboard.
Before the 2,000-mile flight from Moscow to Omsk, they had to abandon their parachutes to reduce weight in the plane.
In the subsequent flight over the Ural Mountains, they used up 10 hours and 52 minutes of fuel, (their plane only held enough fuel for 11 hours), before they reached their destination in a rain storm.

SC board ups tax levy

Taxpayers in the Schoolcraft College District will be paying an additional 0.36 mill tax despite voter defeat of a 0.53 mill levy on June 14.
The college's board of trustees June 28 unanimously passed a resolution levying the additional tax which will mean that property owners will pay \$2.13 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation instead of the present \$1.77.
The board was able to levy the additional millage without voter approval because of the Michigan Community College Act of

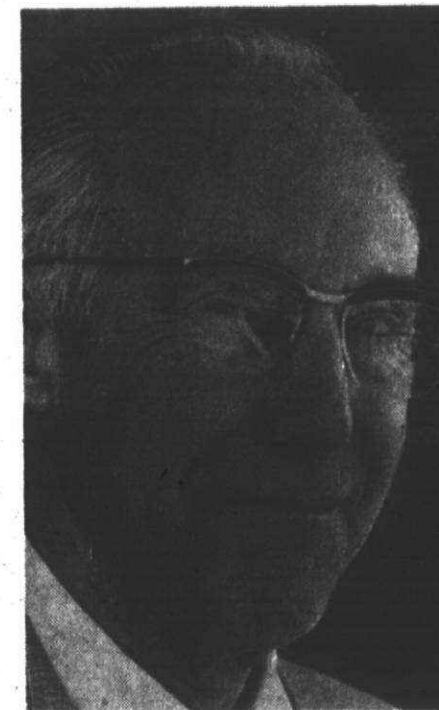
1966, which allows colleges to levy taxes in excess of any limit or voted authorization if necessary to pay debt service on bonds.
Trustee Archibald Vallier, who has opposed the move since it was first discussed by the board in April, was absent when the vote was taken.
A total of \$640,422 will be raised by the additional tax and allocated to various bond debt retirement: \$149,431 (0.084 mill) for 1964 bonds; \$176,116 (0.099 mill) for 1966 bonds; and \$314,875 (0.177 mill) for 1968 bonds.

Sutherland reflects on youth



DON SUTHERLAND

Standing at the intersection of Ann Arbor Road and Main Street, Don Sutherland, the Plymouth CPA, pointed to the area now occupied by Daly's Restaurant and said: "Would you believe that I once cut asparagus on that corner?"
No one loves to stroll down Memory Lane more than Don, a Plymouth High graduate who remained in his home town to make good. So he was in a good mood when he recalled the days of his youth on the farm.

STRANGELY, HIS building and his CPA office is now only a spit and a holler (as the farmers say) from the farm land he helped work until young manhood.
"I was only four years old when my dad bought the 90 acres back in 1909 and I was his helper through the years until we finally went into the business of having a greenhouse and flowers. In fact, at one time I was in partnership with my dad in the greenhouse, but it is the farm that I like to recall on these trips down Memory Lane."
As Don tells the story his father used the 90 acres as a truck farm, raising all sorts of vegetables, but specializing in cabbage, tomatoes, asparagus and sugar beets.
"Our home and barn were located just about where the National Bank of Detroit is now."
"Dad used to farm until late in October. Then, for the winter months he would take a job at Daisy Air Rifle, working for C.J. Hamilton. He did this, as he often said, 'to keep food on the table.'"
All the while Don worked the farm, and he proudly tells you that at one time they had about 15 cows. So, it was quite a chore.
"With all the land available," Don explained, "Dad invited his sister, Elizabeth, to come join us and raise onions."

Here Don smiled as he emphasized, "And she sure raised plenty of onions."
IT IS A LONG way from cutting asparagus as a boy on the family farm to becoming a leading Certified Public Accountant, but Sutherland quickly explained his rise.
"After graduating from Plymouth High School," he said, "I entered Michigan State Normal College (now Eastern Michigan University) and graduated from there. It was then that dad had quit farming and had a greenhouse. I joined him and in 1928 when I joined Rotary and I was admitted to membership under the florist classification."
Evidently, Don had other ideas for a career, so in 1939 he accepted a position as a teacher in the Lapeer School District. Three years of that was enough—so it was back to Plymouth and the greenhouse that was attached to the old home on Ann Arbor Road.
"I started my own business as a CPA," he confided, and opened an office across from the Post Office on Pennington Avenue.
"That was in 1948 and when that building burned down I built our present building and have been there ever since, only a short way from the old farm as I knew as a boy."
WHILE BUILDING up his business, Sutherland and his firm have become the auditors for the City of Plymouth and many of the leading businesses in the Plymouth-Canton community.
The father of four children—three boys and a girl—Don still smiles when he recounts his days on the farm that now is part of the city.
"I still recall that when Dad bought the acreage it was filled with old apple trees

that had outlived their usefulness. He had them cut down. They dynamited the stumps that were left, and that helped prepare the ground for the asparagus I remember so well."
And now, years later, he is in the enviable position of having his own office where he can see the old farm from his window.
"And I never regretted that I stayed in the old home town to fashion my career."

Bookstore profits go in special fund

Now that Schoolcraft College's bookstore has become more than self-supporting, the board of trustees is faced with the problem of what to do with the store's profits.

But a recommendation offered by the college administration, that \$25,000 of the \$35,088 total profit be placed in a special contingency fund to improve and expand services to the college community, didn't seem to be quite what the board had in mind, although the resolution was eventually passed.

The special fund, which will be a metered out primarily for cultural and public affairs programs, drew the criticism of Trustee Mark McQuesten. "I have questions about the use of the money and reservations that the contingency fund stemming from bookstore profits might create the desire to maintain the fund at the same level," he said at Wednesday's board meeting.

"I suggest that we get the profits back to the students, or spend it on a place the students use the most, like the Waterman Center," he added.

Trustee Archibald Vallier was quick to agree: "The profit should be returned back. I don't think a majority of the students should be paying for things like an athletic travel fund (one of the suggested uses for the money)."

Vallier later added that he was not happy with the recommended sum of money to be placed in the fund and sided with Trustee Leroy Bennett's stand that the money should go into the general operating fund rather than a special one.

"I don't like these little niche holes for money," he said.

"Our general fund needs money. By putting the profits in a special budget, we're restricting the use of the money. If it can justify its existence in public affairs, it will find its way there," Bennett said.

Trustee Rosina Raymond made a motion that provided for consultation on the use of the money with the Student Senate, which has been assuming a greater share of the cost of various student programs because of the strained condition of the general operating fund.

The motion was defeated by a 6-2 roll call vote.

After a number of assorted motions and votes all failed to alter the original resolution for the special fund, the board voted 5-3 for the establishment of the \$25,000 contingency fund. Trustees McQuesten, Raymond and Vallier registered the three no votes against the proposition.

Getting Around

Some surprising new sounds are coming out of popular spots in metropolitan Detroit. What's new is the old songs being revived, even discovered for the first time by young entertainers who play and sing them.

At the Top O' The Pontch, the group Fancy Music has returned. Between sets, Tom Elias, its leader from Laurel, Miss., explained in a gentle drawl, that he'd never heard Jolson before. Elias has also discovered Judy Garland.

If you still have Al Jolson and Garland albums around, you will know how they sound—truly great. But it's nice to hear

someone like Elias, who is finding them anew, take their songs and singing with fresh, exuberant interpretations.

He sang the famous Jolson song "Back in Your Own Backyard," with a particularly nostalgic quality. He bounded around the floor energetically, with a long mule cord, going into the audience for "Alabama Bound."

THOSE WHO come expecting to dance to soft strains or rock may be startled to hear a "show set" between "dance sets." It's something different for the Pontch—and some customers would rather dance,

or talk—but if you like to sit back and enjoy, it's an appealing show.

Elias and his group give all they've got, and Elias said he and the drummer are always soaked in sweat at the end of a show. Elias wishes they'd dim the lights, to focus attention more on the stage.

The circular room doesn't lend itself entirely to showtime, but if you're in view of the stage, Elias will probably be coming your way as he sings.

He did "Zing Went the Strings of My Heart," a Garland specialty that was part of her mystique, with his own kind of zing.

Part of Elias' charm is his natural, easy

manner while singing these show-stopper kinds of tunes. He even did "If You Knew Susie," Eddie Cantor's trademark song in a less cloying way than Cantor did.

IN A CHANGE of vocal pace, he sang songs about love, beginning with "You Made Me Love You." He also turned to "The Fantasticks" and the favorite "Try to Remember."

Giving Elias good backup are group members Gene Houston on drums, Lowery Hicks on bass, Stewart Redd on lead guitar and keyboardist Paul Kepple.

During the early "show set" Elias generated audience enthusiasm as the group kicked out their legs in a strut to "Waiting for the Robert E. Lee."

At the midnight show, the group really puts on a show, coming out dressed in tails, he said. Fancy Music is a relatively new group, and Elias said most of them are from Laurel, where they first got together.

The curly-haired leader and the rest of Fancy Music, with their ruffled shirt fronts, are playing a month-long engagement at the Top O' The Pontch. They appear Tuesdays through Saturdays from 7:30 p.m. to 1 a.m.

THIS IS a return engagement for the group which has created a lot of interest and fans. You've got to give Elias credit for trying something new—er, old.

Ole Christenson, who runs the Pontchart-rain, and executive chef Bob Bossio are trying out shark on the menu. These are fillets from baby sharks, cut and served in medallions.

It's a different entree, even if you like fish, since most people are unfamiliar, even leery, of shark. For someone who was too scared to see "Jaws," eating shark was no problem.

The meat tasted quite flavorful, but other opinions at the table ranged all the way to "bland," although everyone agreed the shark has a good texture and is tasty.

Shark comes from New Orleans, where it is popular with diners, and if it goes over here, it may be a mainstay on the Chuck Muer seafood menu.

YESTERDAYS, where crowds including lots of singles gather in the Sheraton-Southfield, has brought in the musical group Expo 77. As you may guess by its name, this is something new.

The group has actually been together two years and opened last summer in this area at the Michigan Inn. They're three guys and a gal vocalist. All the fellows are from Brooklyn, and the girl is from California, but now she lives in Brooklyn, too.

Marilyn O'Day is a stunning, tall strawberry-blond. She said the group used to be four guys, who called themselves Brass Expo, and switched the name at the time she joined the group.

Cabaret at Cobo concerts slated

The Detroit Symphony Orchestra will offer three different musical evenings in Cobo Hall's Riverview Ballroom on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (Aug. 19) when DSO principal pops conductor Richard Hayman mounts the podium for "Cabaret at Cobo."

The series, which will highlight the talents of two promising young Detroit musicians, is designed to raise funds for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's many youth concert series.

These programs were left without adequate support earlier this summer, when the DSO was omitted from the City of Detroit budget for the first time since the orchestra was re-established in 1951. The DSO hopes to recover some of that loss in presenting this late-summer Cabaret series.

DSO youth programs include the Young People's Concerts series, the Educational Concerts series, the In-school concert series and the Detroit Symphony Youth Orchestra—a total of some 60 concerts a year for almost 100,000 youngsters.

The two young soloists to be featured during "Cabaret at Cobo" are both members of the Detroit Youth Symphony Orchestra. Violinist Susan Synnstedt will perform the Mendelssohn Violin Concerto on Wednesday evening, and pianist Kenneth Kelter of Birmingham will play Mendelssohn's Piano Concerto No. 1 on Thursday evening, Aug. 19.

All three evenings' concerts have been designed by conductor Hayman to follow the time-honored "pops" format, blending light classics, popular tunes and several "pops extras."

Violinist Susan Synnstedt is 13 years old. She began her violin studies at age 4 under Jeanne Rupert at the Detroit Community Music School, and has studied with Detroit Symphony violinist Roy Bengtson since she was 10.

Winner of many local auditions and competitions, Miss Synnstedt is also a composer: In 1975 she won a National PTA Award for her composition "Heritage Theme and Variations" for solo violin.

Sixteen-year-old Kenneth Kelter is pianist of the Detroit Symphony Youth Orchestra, and studies piano with Maryan Abramson. A native of Birmingham, he is a student at Groves High School, and hopes to attend the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia.

Besides the Grinnell Award, he has won several other prizes, including the Schoolcraft College Award in 1975.

Tables seating four will provide an intimate cabaret atmosphere at the concerts.

Cheerleaders from Westland John Glenn captured the two most prestigious awards at a recent camp conducted in Pocono, Pa.

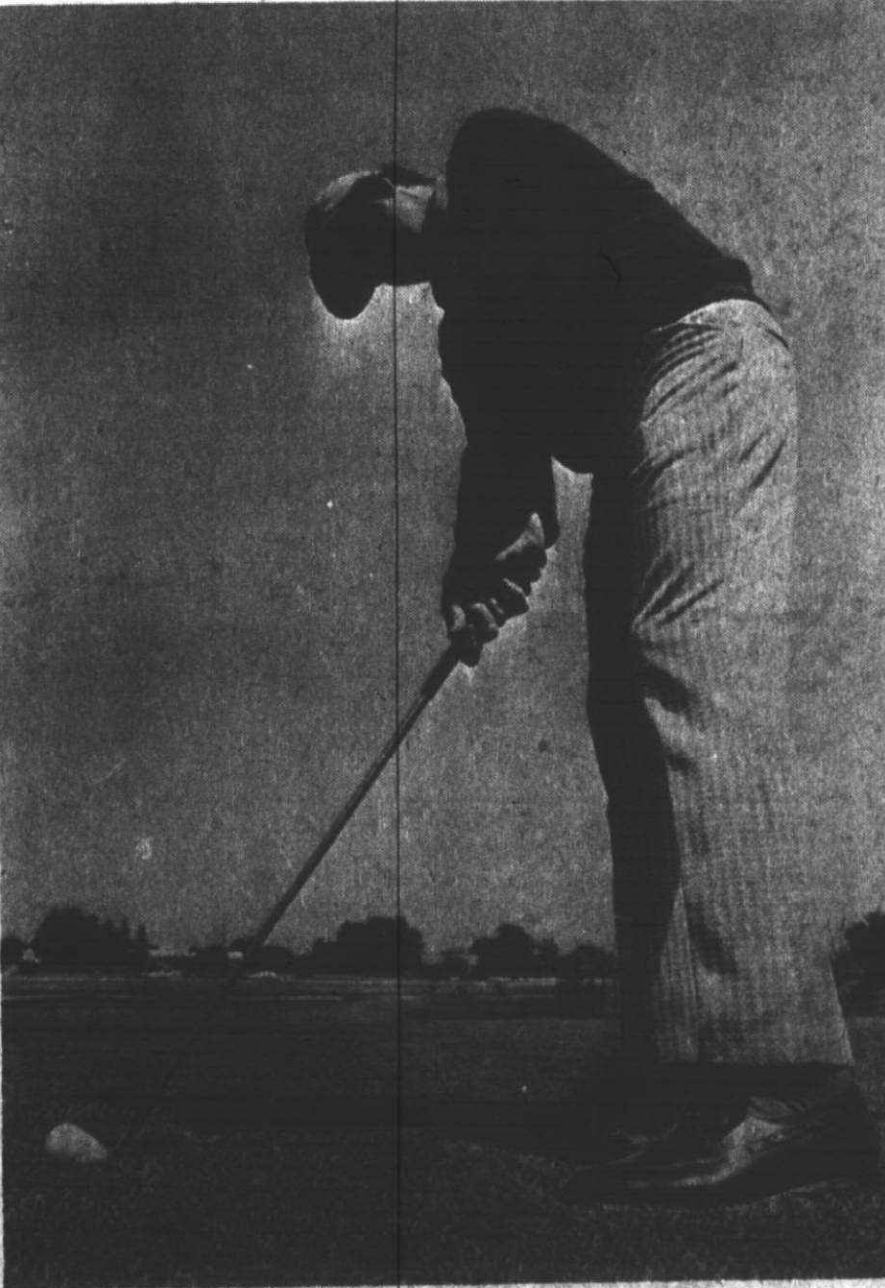
The girls received a plaque for overall performance during the clinic and a megaphone for being voted the squad that contributed most to the camp.

On to Johnstown

Redford wins regional

Redford Adray next week will make its 11th journey to the All-American Amateur Baseball Association championships in Johnstown, Pa.

First-year manager John Colley and his crew earned a spot in the 16-team national finals by sweeping Belleville last weekend in a best-of-three regional series at Eastern Michigan University, 9-0 and 8-1.

Pitching carried the Redford aggregation into the finals, Colley admitted, as Steve Perry limited Belleville to three hits in the regional finals and Brian McMahon held Belleville to a like number of hits in the semi-finals.

Redford collected three more runs in the fourth on walks to Ted Musto, Dennis Kuschel and Art Mezigan, a two-run single by Ted Ackerman and a wild pitch.

A single by George Willard, a groundout and an error accounted for another Redford run in the fifth frame. Kuschel walked to start a two-run rally in the sixth. He stole second and scored on a Mezigan single. Mezigan stole second and scored himself on a single by Ackerman.

Walks to Ackerman, Randy Rodriguez and Willard preceded a single by Robertson in the eighth inning for the final two runs of the game.

The story of the first regional contest was almost the same as the second—all Redford.

The locals struck for two runs in the opening inning and never trailed from that point.

Mezigan and Ackerman walked and Rodriguez singled to load the bases. Anderson sent Mezigan home with a single and Ackerman scored on a fielder's choice, with Robertson credited with the RBI.

Redford added two more runs in the second inning. Musto singled, Kuschel was hit

by a pitch and Mezigan singled to load the bases.

Ackerman forced Musto at the plate, but Kuschel scored on a fielder's choice and Mezigan crossed the plate on a passed ball. Rodriguez hit the ground ball which enabled Kuschel to score.

Redford reaped two more runs in the third when Kuschel walked with the sacks loaded and Mezigan laid down a good bunt on the squeeze play.

The bases had been loaded prior to that when Willard was safe on an error. Mike Donahue was hit by a pitch and Musto singled.

Rodriguez singled to start another Redford scoring thrust in the fourth frame, stole second and came home on a single by Robertson.

Redford tallied its final run in the sixth on a single by Anderson, a wild pick-off attempt and a groundout. Willard was credited with the RBI that inning.

Redford, which advanced all the way to the semi-finals of last year's AAABA championships before failing to eventual titlist Little Caesars, will arrive in Johnstown next Tuesday for the week-long double-elimination tourney.
