Reserves get their day in court

On Wednesday, Sept. 1, the much-disputed Canton Township Police Reserve force will be the subject of a show-cause hearing in Wayne Circuit Judge Thomas B. Sullivan's courtroom.

The 2:15 p.m. hearing is the result of a class action suit submitted in court Tuesday by defeated trustee candidate Noel Culbert, on behalf of the plaintiff, Leonard Wasczenski of Canton Township. "Charter Township of Canton" is named as defendant in the lawsuit which seeks to enjoin the reserves.

"A lot of people have been saying that we should file suit against the reserves and I agreed," Culbert said. "We needed someone who could take a lot of heat and that's why he (Wasczenski) was chosen. There's a lot of people out there who will still love a police force even if it's illegal."

Culbert ran independently Aug. 3 but supports the Harold Stein slate. He says the main contention of the lawsuit is that "for any regular police officer to be on the street, he has to be certified by the Michigan Law Enforcement Training Act which requires a minimum of 240 hours of training."

Culbert says that reserve police can operate only under the direction of a certified police department.

"GREENSTEIN SAYS the reserves are

under his direction as chief of police of Canton Township," Culbert said. "He believes he's the only person they need to make up a regular police department."

Supervisor-Police Chief Robert Greenstein graduated in the first class of the Canton reserves at Schoolcraft College with 100 hours of academy training. Greenstein claims the reserves operate under the authority granted to him and Carl Silvers, reserve commander.

"Any department that regularly employs less than three officers doesn't need certification by law," Greenstein said. "Regularly employed means keeping regular hours. Carl Silvers and I are the only two who could conceivably be called employed."

Silvers has stated in the past that he will accept no pay for his "volunteer work" on the reserves. Reserves will be paid \$2.25 but Greenstein has said that many will return their pay.

Mining no words in responding to news of the lawsuit, Greenstein called it "rank stupidity. Politically-motivated stupidity."

"It's just another in the continuing attempt by the coalition of the Stein slate and the Wayne County Sheriff's Union to kill the reserves in order to insure a

\$600,000 contract with the sheriff. That is the current figure for four cars contracted 24 hours a day."

CULBERT SAID the lawsuit also asks Canton to clearly define the duties, powers, and regulations governing both the "regular police officer" and the reserves.

"Essentially we're putting the cart before the horse," Culbert said. "The reserve police is pulling the police department."

Greenstein lost the Democratic primary bid to Harold Stein, while Peter Bundarin ran unopposed in the Republican race for Canton supervisor.

Bundarin says he too would like to see a specific, detailed manual spelling out the duties and limits of the reserve's power.

"I'd like to see in black and white, that you don't handle certain matters," Bundarin said. "The two biggest dangers in police protection is traffic stops and domestic relations. More police officers are killed by these two things than any other. So, knowing that, do not let them handle traffic calls and domestic calls."

Bundarin disagrees with Stein's comment that the reserves should be unarmed. "If you do send a man out on the street

today in a patrol car without a gun, his life is in danger and people will take shots at him."

Stein sticks to his guns, saying the reserves should not.

Until the legal questions about the reserves are settled "there should be a moratorium on them," Stein said.

"I say they're illegal."

If elected, Stein says he will commission a study to find the "most economical" way to provide law enforcement in Canton. After the study is complete, he says the matter will be put to a vote.

Stein doesn't believe the citizens of Canton would vote in a millage to fund a full-time unit in the near future.

"I won't say Canton will never have a

full-time unit, I'm just saying that right now the cost would be out of sight," he said.

Stein objects to Greenstein's allegation that he and Eugene Daley, (a trustee candidate on the Stein slate who is a member of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department) have already promised to contract with the sheriff for township patrol.

But Stein says that the city of Romulus recently found that contracting with the sheriff "was the most economical way to go—and there's a lot of people working over there."

Romulus reportedly pays the county \$1.2 million yearly for sheriff patrol and detectives.

Trickster tricked Magician's box disappears

"Talk about tricks," lamented Plymouth magician John Cummings. "They used an old one on me. They tricked the trickster."

Cummings, a former member of the Plymouth City Commission and a professional magician for years, sipped a cup of coffee and sadly outlined details of the van-

ishing trick he did not pull.

Someone—young adolescents, Cummings believes—Sunday used a coat hanger to break into the magician's locked car and used the vanishing trick of thieves on cases of props and tools used in magical tricks.

"I'm besides myself, because I don't have any of my props," said Cummings.

who is scheduled to perform magical shows next month. "Some of the things are irreplaceable. They just don't make them anymore. It just makes me sick."

Although numerous magicians throughout the Detroit area have offered Cummings use of their props, the Plymouth resident hopes the thieves return the cases of props and tools which, Cummings says, are worthless to anyone but a magician. Cummings is even willing to offer a reward for the props' return.

"In a way, I hate to do that," Cummings says. "I'm rewarding someone for being bad, which I'm totally against. But all I really want is to have my props back."

INCLUDED IN the cases of tools and props were silks used in Cummings' magic act, stage makeup and props given to the Plymouth resident by friends and other magicians. A "disappearing" table as well as a briefcase, stuffed with business papers and Cummings' wallet and checkbook, were coveted by the thieves.

The "vanishing" act apparently took place last Sunday, when Cummings returned to his home in Plymouth from a magicians' convention in Colon, Mich. Suffering from a backache, Cummings left his briefcase and heavy cases of magicians' tools in his locked car.

Cummings believes a CB radio antenna attracted the thieves to the car.

"But I had already taken the CB out," the magician said. "If I had known they wanted the CB, I would have left it in the car. I can replace the credit cards and the checkbook, and I lost \$20 with my wallet. But it's the magic I really care about."

"The things are like toys to people who don't know how to use them. They're not good to anyone but a magician. But to me they had a lot of nostalgic value. I had all kinds of things. I really have no idea how much everything's worth."

CUMMINGS, judging from handprints left by the thieves, believes young adolescents performed the "vanishing act."

"All the stuff's like toys to kids. They'll play with it for awhile, but, not knowing what to do with it, they'll get tired of it. I can see them just tossing the stuff into Tonquish Creek."

"To me, it's one of the saddest things that's ever happened. I just hope they drop the stuff off to me, when they discover they can't use it anymore."

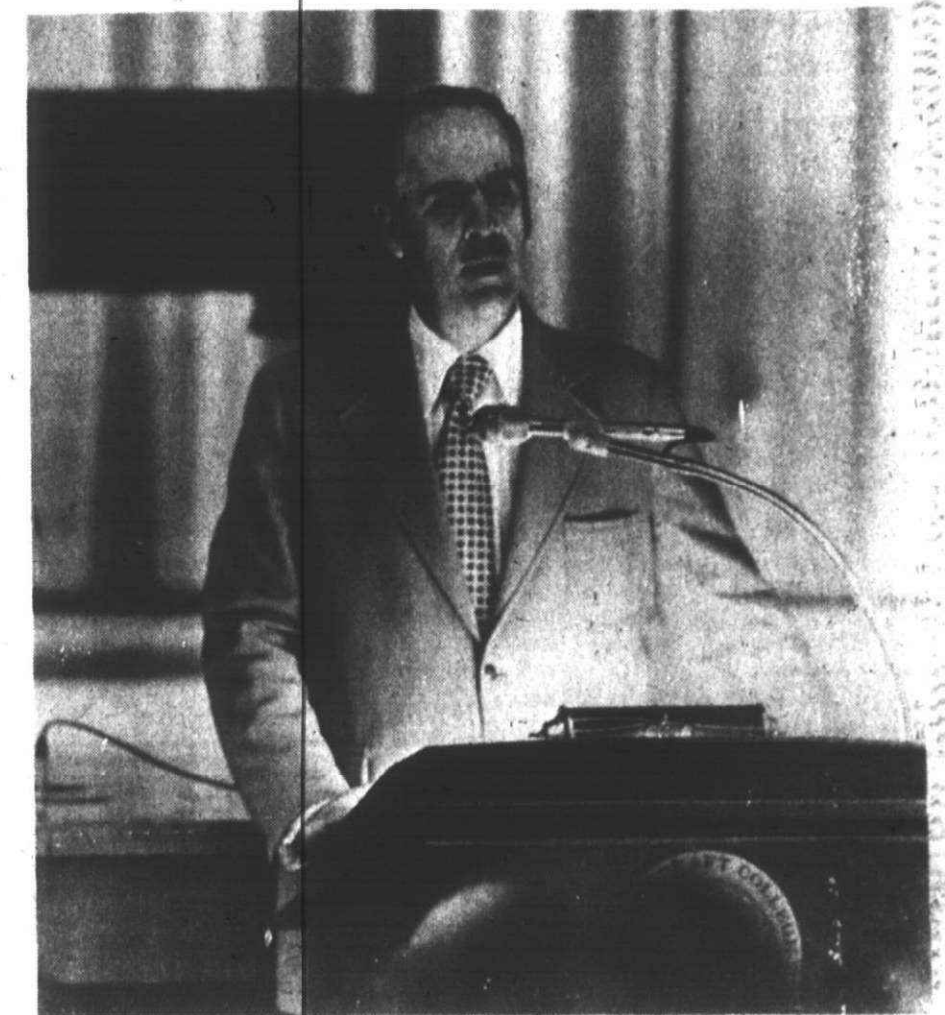
Cummings, who calls magic an "art," became interested in the magicians' trade, when his father gave him a "magic" light bulb when he was eight-years-old. The Plymouth resident began frequenting "magic" shops in Detroit and taking lessons from well-established magicians.

For the last several years, Cummings has worked as a professional magician be-

tween his work as an advertising salesman and "Mr. Ringmaster" on television's "Bozo" show. He has toured the United States and Greece as a magician.

"I've lived with magic so long that it's probably one of the closest things to me. The magical things stolen have made a lot of people happy, not only around Plymouth, but all over."

"All the stuff's gone now," Cummings said. "It's lost. They kind of stripped me of my thing. Unless I get the things back, I'll have to slowly beg, borrow and buy my props."

POAM finds no conflict with Parsell's action

The 19-member board of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM) ruled last Friday that the Canton Township Police Reserve unit and Carl Parsell have not been shown to be a threat to police job security nor in conflict with the association's goal of police professionalism.

Conflict-of-interest charges were formally leveled at Parsell, who serves both as executive director of the POAM and treasurer of the Canton Township Board. The complaint was registered by Carl Berry, detective sergeant in the Plymouth Police Department.

Parsell supports and helped set up the armed, full-power reserve police unit that is operating independently in the township.

"Are the members of the POAM in favor of the kind of minimally-trained department Canton has enacted," Berry asked after attending the POAM board meeting at Houghton Lake, Mich. "If they are, then there's no conflict."

"Despite what he says, my dispute is not with Carl Parsell but with the POAM position on this matter."

In his complaint to the POAM board, Berry urged the association to redefine its position regarding reserve police.

"This reserve force will be paid about \$2.25 an hour, carry a weapon, and have arrest power," Berry stated. "They have received only about 120 hours of training and generally will be working without an assigned regular police officer. This is due to the fact that there is not a regular police force in Canton Township. The point I am concerned about is that the POAM has

expressed (the need for) professionalism in police work."

Berry said the POAM board didn't adequately answer his questions.

"Carl Parsell started a lawsuit against the reserves in Detroit so they wouldn't take over any police officer's job. Now here he is starting a reserve force in his position on the Canton board. It strikes me as more than a little inconsistent."

Asked whether he would call the Canton reserve officers "professionals," Parsell replied:

"What is this—an attempt to put me on the spot? I think these people are exactly what I said they are: They are citizens helping citizens. Most of them hold professional jobs in their own right during the day. They are citizens helping citizens."

Parsell called the 26-person reserve unit "a stop-gap measure" which would provide some protection for citizens without having to wait for the results of the lawsuit concerning sheriff patrol obligations.

Parsell said Berry previously had opposed the POAM union.

No police agencies in the area have been supplanted by the Canton reserves, according to Parsell.

"We made sure that every reserve officer is well-advised that they are not taking over from other police agencies," Parsell said. "Chances are at night, the people will call the regular police, not us. If your house is being broken into you'll call the sheriff or the state police, not us."

"We monitor their calls," Parsell said. "Certainly we'll give help and remain on standby. For example at that serious injury accident at Michigan and Sheldon we aided and comforted the injured and directed traffic at the scene until the Wayne County Sheriffs arrived. Then our men stepped back and asked Wayne County what they could do to help. Later, one of the troopers came in to the reserve station and thanked us for the cooperation at the scene. That was before they were told we were the bad guys; the vigilantes."

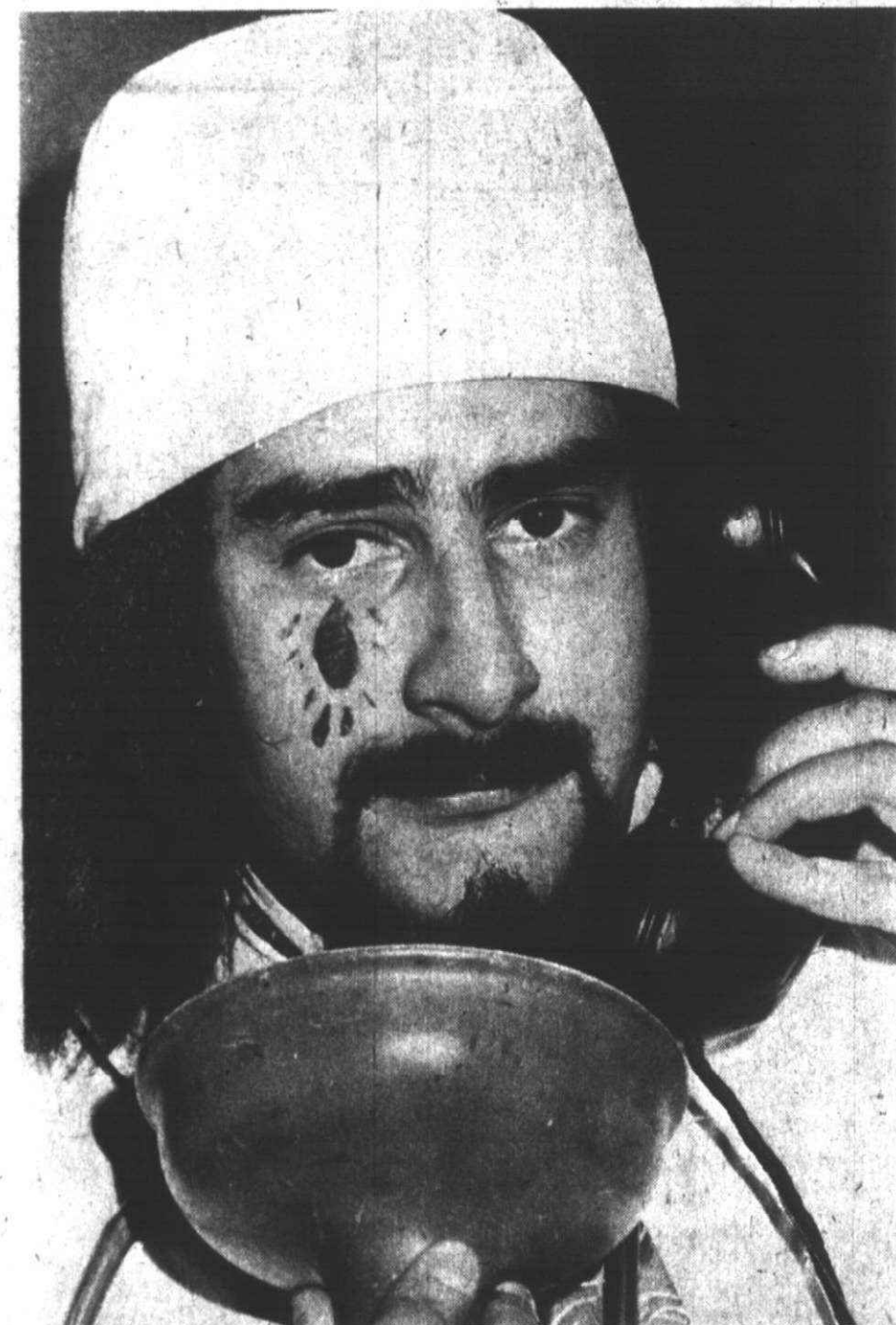
Parsell charges that the reserve controversy has been inflamed by members of the Wayne County Sheriff's union and opponents of his on the Harold Stein township political slate.

"The whole concept of citizen-helping-citizen has gone out the window because of a lack of issues in the township political campaign," Parsell said.

"Look at these reserves. The poor guy could have gone down to the fire department and signed up as a reserve fireman and he would get his picture in the paper and be given a medal for being such a conscientious citizen."

"Everyone would say, 'There's an up-right citizen—true Americanism.'"

"Well here you have a citizen who wants to do what he can to help the community by being a reserve policeman," Parsell explained. "And, because of the political situation, he's painted as a vigilante. Better move out or they'll kill my kids."

Trustees agree on millage

With the school election a week away, the request for 4.75 mills for operation has received the endorsement of at least three major groups.

The Plymouth Board of Education passed a resolution Monday night declaring its official support of the millage and followed up with a letter of endorsement signed by each trustee.

This past week, statements have also been released by the Plymouth branch of the American Association of University Women and the League of Women Voters of Plymouth-Northville-Canton-Novi urging residents to vote "yes" on the millage Sept. 2.

AND AS THE hour of decision on millage approaches, the administration and teachers' union remain hopeful that a settlement on a contract can be reached before the millage election.

Rumors have been circulating through parts of the Plymouth Community School

District that the teachers' union is deliberately delaying settlement until after the millage election so it can ask for more money if the tax request is approved.

A joint statement from the board's negotiating team and the Plymouth Education Association (PEA), teachers union, was issued Tuesday. In that statement, both sides stressed:

"The negotiating teams for the board and the PEA are continuing to progress at a satisfactory rate. Although economic issues have not been resolved, the desire to reach tentative agreement before the Sept. 2 millage vote remains the goal of both teams."

At Monday night's meeting, the school board adopted an official resolution stating trustees unanimously endorse passage of the tax question on Thursday's special election ballot.

That proposal, as it will read on the ballot, is: "Shall the limitation on the amount

of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Plymouth Community School District, Wayne and Washtenaw counties, Michigan, be increased by 4.75 mills (\$4.75 on each \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) for a period of five years, 1976-80 inclusive, for the purpose of providing additional funds for operating purposes?"

AFTER ADOPTION of that resolution a separate letter of endorsement was released by the school board, which read:

"As your elected representatives on the Plymouth Community School District Board of Education, we have many different viewpoints. Wouldn't you rather that the board members represent the varied opinions in the community?"

"But we all do agree that schools are important. We dedicate many hours trying to make the schools better. We urge you to spend a few minutes on Thursday, Sept. 2, (Continued on page 3A)

Ninth grade freshmen at Centennial Educational Park (CEP) will report to school Sept. 10 for an orientation to the high school.

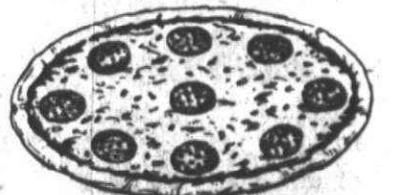
School hours have not been set yet, since they depend on the millage vote on Sept. 2. Voters will be asked to either approve or deny 4.75 mills.

Pioneer's great-grandson to observe 90th birthday

Walter Kellogg Sumner of Bradner Road in Plymouth Township will celebrate his 90th birthday on Sept. 1 with a quiet gathering of family and friends.

Sumner spends most of his time in his library, a pleasant room filled with books, paintings and memorabilia of his 90 years. Regular checkups at the VA hospital in Ann Arbor prove he's in good health.

He gives no magic formula for a healthy old age. He still smokes several cigarettes a day and enjoys an after-dinner drink. "My only medication," he says with a smile. But he adds, "My grandfather lived to be 99."

Kellogg Park and Kellogg street bear the name of his great-grandfather John Kellogg, who built his family home on Ann Arbor Trail where the Christian Science Church now stands. Joel Street was named after Sumner's grandfather, Joel Kellogg.

On the Sumner side of the family, his grandfather was one of the founders of the Republican Party in 1854 "under the oaks" at Jackson, Mich.

"WE STILL HAVE a piece of the oak," he said. "And I'm still a Republican. Walter Sumner was born in Rome, N.Y., in 1886. When he was very young, the family moved to Detroit where he graduated from Central High School and the Detroit College of Law.

His first trip to Europe was with the American City Bureau when a group trav-

eled to Dusseldorf, Germany—the first city in the world to have a city manager form of government.

He was back again during World War I, as a commissioned officer. One of his duties was serving as town major in a French city.

"It was a liaison duty, because I could speak French. It was just high school French, but it served the purpose."

Following the war, he was elected judge in Marysville, and 53 years ago he married Ann Gilmour of Port Huron.

WHEN HE INHERITED the old Kellogg home on the trail, he moved his family to Plymouth. It was there they raised their family—a son and a daughter.

With the children grown and gone, the old house was too large for two people. So they moved to a smaller home in the township.

"I never practiced law," said Sumner. "But I used my legal training, serving with many organizations."

He was secretary of the Michigan Manufacturers Association and said that although he did not meet the elder Henry Ford, "I knew Harry Bennett, his strong-arm man."

He served on the Plymouth Township Board of Review and was active in St. John's Episcopal Church. Mrs. Sumner's birthday, their wedding

The Plymouth Open has been slated for Sept. 19, at Fox Hills, 8768 Territorial, Plymouth.

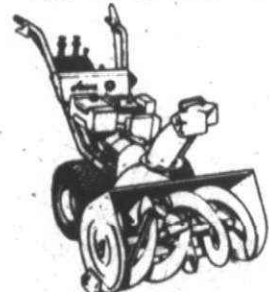
The second annual Plymouth Open, sponsored by the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce, will feature a buffet luncheon as well as the competition among duffers.

There will be prizes with the top award being a weekend for two at the Plymouth Hilton. The golf event is open to the public.

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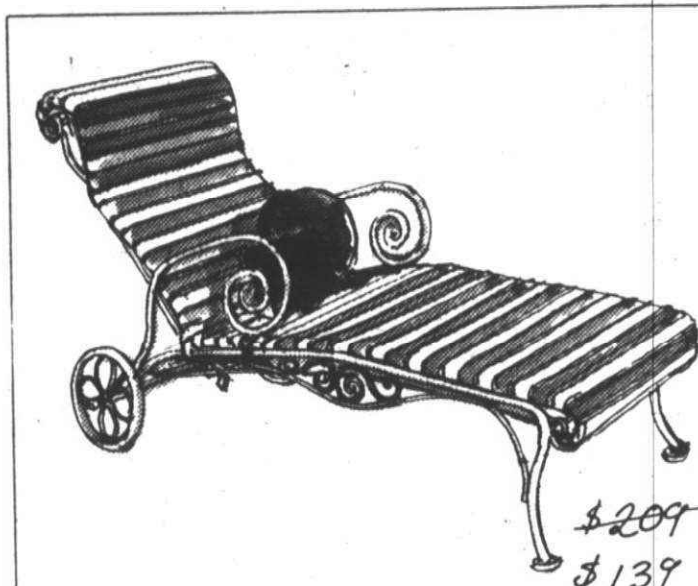
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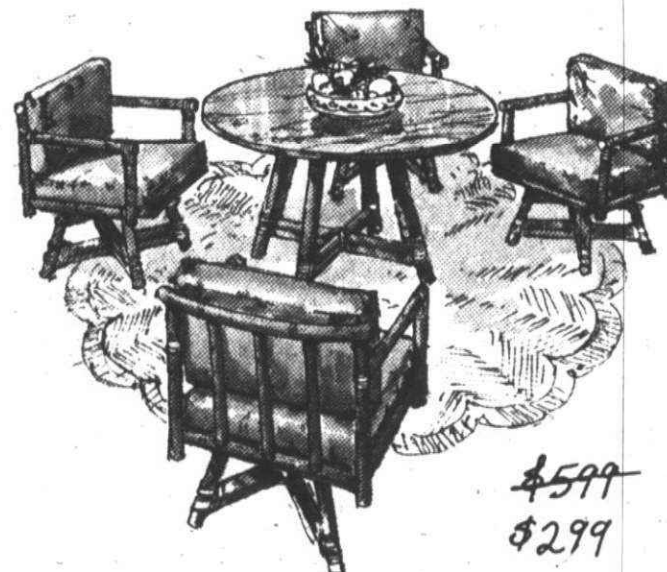
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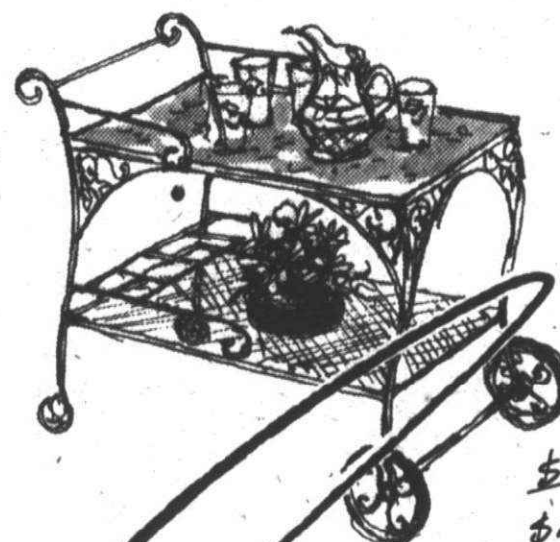
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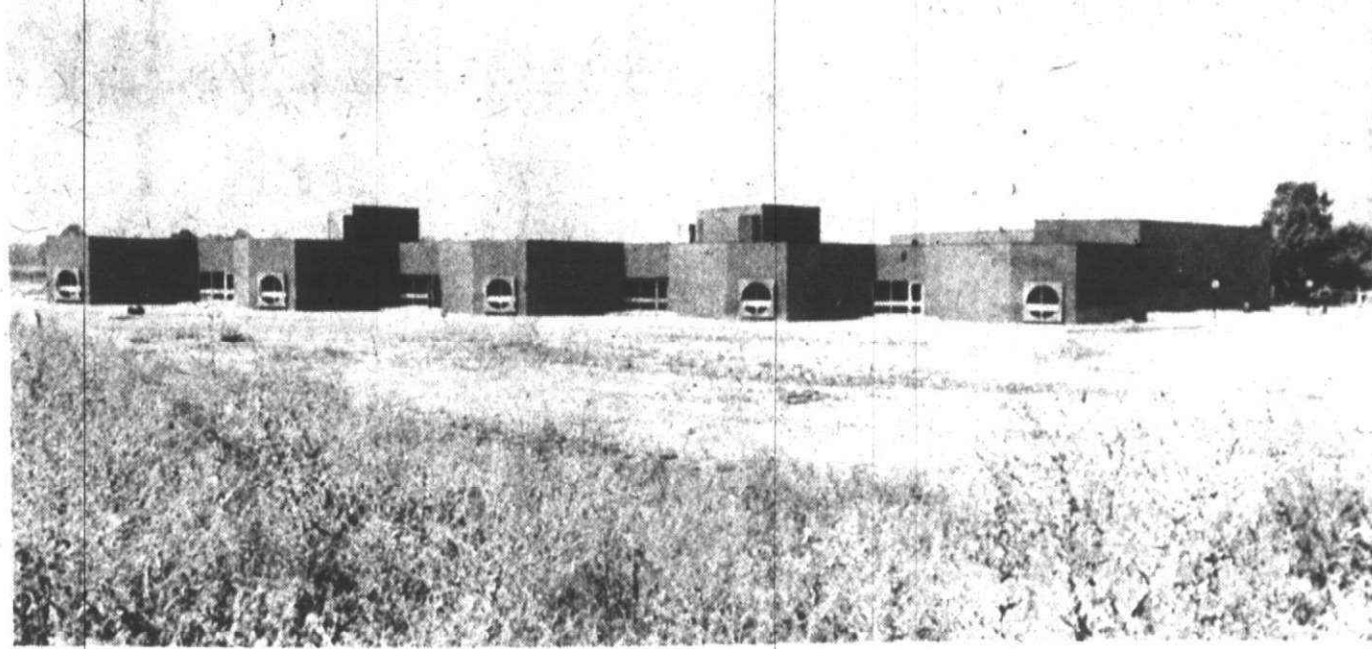

3 new elementaries to be filled by 1,900

Approximately 1,900 Canton elementary school pupils will enjoy an extra dash of excitement Sept. 13 when they step into a new school year and a spanking new school building.

The students will attend one of three new elementary schools opening this fall in the Plymouth Community School District.

The schools, according to Larry Miller, principal of Field Elementary School, Kathryn Otto, principal of Hulsing, and Ronald South, principal of Eriksson, are "flexibly-oriented schools" offering various teaching and learning styles.

"We're trying to work out a flexible school with ingredients of open education as well as traditional classrooms," explained

South. "Our aim is to provide both types of classes to meet the needs of students."

The majority of students who will attend Eriksson Elementary School, on Haggerty south of Ford, last year attended Starkweather, Smith, Isbister, Farrand and Fiegel elementary schools, South said.

Current projections peg Eriksson's enrollment at about 680 pupils. According to South, the school's capacity is about 780 pupils, if 30 students are assigned to each classroom.

On Tuesday, Eriksson administrators had registered 130 kindergartners, 150 first graders, 115 second graders, 90 third graders, 90 fourth graders and 85 fifth graders.

Enrollment figures released Tuesday by Field Elementary School administrators reveal that kindergartners will compose the single largest group of pupils at that elementary school this year.

Of the 640 pupils registered at Field by Tuesday, 145 were kindergartners, 117 were first graders, 109 were second graders, 103 were third graders, 92 were fourth graders and 69 were fifth graders.

Most of the pupils who will attend the new Field school, on Haggerty south of Ford, last year attended Central Elementary School, according to Miller. About 20 per cent are new to the district, while the remainder last year attended Isbister, Starkweather and East elementary schools.

Miller estimates the capacity of Field at about 700.

"If THINGS continue the way we're going, we might be at capacity by January," the principal said. "It makes it clear that we needed the new buildings."

According to Mrs. Otto, 562 kindergarten

through fifth graders are registered for September at Hulsing Elementary School, in Windsor Park subdivision. On Tuesday, 92 kindergartners were registered, 110 first graders, 96 second graders, 93 third graders, 97 fourth graders and 72 fifth graders.

The students last year attended Smith, Central, Gallimore and East elementary schools.

Mrs. Otto said the capacity of Hulsing school depends on the number of kindergartners enrolled, since those students only attend a half-day of school.

Administrators are asked to pay off \$480 lawn job

School Board Trustee Marcia Borowski believes the Plymouth Community School District paid \$480 to cut, feed and fertilize an area of ground that isn't big enough to graze guinea pigs on.

At Monday night's board meeting Ms. Borowski made a motion to deny payment to Good's Nursery of Plymouth and suggested that the administrators responsible for ordering the mini-lawnscape pay the \$480.

"Go look at the area we're talking about," said Ms. Borowski. "It's about the size of two of these large tables. Let a guinea pig loose there and in a week he could chop it clean. It was a dumb expense—\$120 a month to pay someone to take care of half a postage stamp in front of the administration building."

Board member Thomas Yack shook his head after Ms. Borowski made her comments and said, "It's going to be tough to get the quote of the week." Yack proposed

that the board approve the payment of the bills but get a legal opinion on "what impact would not paying that one bill have on the school district?"

That motion was defeated by a 3-2 vote with Yack and Borowski voting in favor of it.

"I just can't feel the board of education can go without paying our bills just because they don't agree with an expenditure," Secretary Flossie Tonda said in voting down the motion.

"You may be right that it was a dumb expense. But we hire our people to do their job," she added. "And I can't imagine the school district not paying our bills."

School administrators told the board that the landscaping is no longer contracted out and was done at a time "when 11 full-time custodial people left the district."

Board President Joseph Gray said the decision to pay the nursery to landscape the administration building was made by the

former director of maintenance and custodial operations, James Symonds.

"The fact is, it was done, and now we have a bill to pay," said Gray.

Ms. Borowski was the only board member to vote against the payment of the bills.

Market plans uncertain

Will Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein's vision of a bustling township-owned farmers market die in the election booth this November?

Greenstein, who suffered defeat at the hands of supervisor challenger Harold Stein in August's Democratic primary, believes his dream of a huge farmers market complex in Canton will hit the butcher block along with the township's controversial master land use plan.

But Stein and Peter Bundarin, Republican candidate for the supervisor's post, stress their willingness to examine the farmers market proposal.

"I'M VERY interested in the farmers market idea," Stein said. "I'm open, believe me, but I think the people should have a voice. I just don't think you can talk about bond issues, until the people look at it."

Said Bundarin, "I'd be interested in doing a study. But would a farmers market in western Wayne County be a viable competition to Eastern Market? There's a question mark in my mind."

The farmers market, now being studied by the township's Citizens' Advisory Council (CAC), would create competition for the 10-acre Eastern Market in Detroit and include acres of township-owned produce stalls, according to Greenstein's hopes.

The huge complex, according to the supervisor's proposal, would include privately-owned restaurants and warehouse facilities. The township board, Greenstein said, could incorporate the farmers market and appoint a board of directors to issue revenue bonds and run the corporation.

Greenstein's proposal follows a farmers market study, conducted by the Canton Chamber of Commerce four years ago. According to former chamber president Bart Berg, at that time the chamber proposed establishment of a township-owned farmers market, financed by bonds or millage.

But Greenstein feels the establishment and success of a farmers market in Canton depends on the implementation of the township's controversial master land use plan, which reserves thousands of acres west of Canton Center for agricultural use.

Both Stein and Bundarin have criticized the land use plan. Bundarin, who favors control of the township's growth, questions the legality of the plan, while Stein favors equal growth on the eastern and western sides of the township.

Township officials must approve a zoning ordinance to implement the plan, already approved by the Canton Planning Commission.

"THERE WOULD be no real reason to establish a farmers market without viable agriculture in the community," Greenstein maintains. "We not only wanted to increase the tax base and attract other businesses to the township through the market but to help the farmers out as well."

"Without the master land use plan, the farmers market will probably go down the drain."

But Stein and Bundarin disagree. Although neither candidate has expressed strong support for the farmers market concept, they stress their willingness to study the idea regardless of the present master land use plan's future.

Class-skipppers warned

In response to criticism from parents, Bill Brown, principal of Plymouth Salem High School, says the district has devised a new system of reporting student's absences to parents.

Brown promises that parents will be periodically getting a copy of a computer read-out which will tell them how many "mods" their child skipped in addition to telling them the student's "academic deficiencies."

"It's a dual program of the two high schools and I'm sure that in the first six or seven weeks we'll have to trim some rough edges. The system is tied in with the Wayne County Intermediate school district and it's an accurate, legal attendance record. Each teacher on a Friday will mark down every instance where a student was absent from any phase of the school program. This information is fed into an OLS-CAN reader, which will probably be operated by a co-op student."

"We can set the computer to kick back four, six, eight, 10 or even two or one absences on record," Brown explained.

"Whatever we set the iron master to kick back at us, it will do."

Brown said that for the reporting system to work, it requires teacher accountability in submitting accurate attendance reports.

ANOTHER ACADEMIC acronym will be unveiled this year at CEP with the introduction of Student Teacher Planning (STP) period. According to Brown, this period will enable an area coordinator to sit down with a student and advise and assist him in filling out his schedule for assigned and unassigned time.

"With the STP period we should be able to tell a parent that yes, we sat down with the student when he was planning his academic endeavor," Brown said. "There are 22 places on the schedule where he or she has a choice and we can say that they filled it out in our presence."

Brown says that no student may elect two consecutive unassigned mods under the CEP schedule.

Hall monitoring will be more vigorously enforced this year, Brown said, particularly by making sure students report to their homeroom.

Students who have failed to show up for their homeroom will find a "U" for unsatisfactory on their report, Brown said.

"There are 160 homerooms and the first thing every Monday morning the students will report," Brown said. "The plant closes down for those 20 minutes. And hall monitors have been instructed of this fact. We've got to clean out those halls and get those students in their class."

Trustee Richard Arlen asked Brown what would be done about students who attend the wrong class just because "it might be more interesting, more fun or their friends are all in there."

"It's the teacher's responsibility to ask them to leave," Brown said.

Arlen was also concerned that classroom decorum was being violated by teachers who allow students to call them by their first name. Arlen asked Brown if he allowed students to call him by his first name.

Brown said he didn't think they called him Mr. Brown on the lavatory walls. "But they do not call me Bill in school, I assure you."

HOME prexy stepping down

Charles Costa, of Southfield, has stepped down as president of the Housing Owners of Michigan Exchange (HOME) and taken a three-month leave of absence from its board of directors.

HOME's directors have accepted Costa's actions without opposition and with the understanding that he will not be a candidate

for further office with the nonprofit corporation, according to an announcement made by HOME officials.

Costa said he was taking the steps to free himself to start another organization which would represent the owners of single family homes as contrasted to the owners of multiple rental properties.

Stanley van Reken, one of the founders of HOME, has been promoted from vice-president to president pending a board election Sept. 14.

Van Reken said HOME was aiming at a realignment which would increase its effectiveness in fighting social and governmental factors affecting rental properties.

Reserves lack leadership

Editor:

Good leadership is very important when dealing with a law enforcement agency. In fact it is an absolute necessity. In regards to leadership, Canton's reserves are lacking. Therefore we innocent citizens of Canton are faced with a two-sided dilemma.

First we're faced with no leadership or direction from the Wayne County Sheriffs or State Police. By law for a "reserve" force to hit the roads, they have to be under the direction of either the state or the Sheriff's department. Our reserves are

not. Yet they are on the roads!

Secondly, if we want to stay on the roads, without a lawsuit hanging over our heads, we have to be declared a police department. Through maneuvering and just barely touching the boundary of working within the law, I really think Mr. (Robert) Greenstein, who is supervisor and coincidentally the chief of police, can and will begin to make the reserves, with only reserve training, into a police department.

They'll have full powers and will not have to be under the direction of the Sheriff or state (police) departments.

This is a disadvantageous plot. Number one, the reserves don't have enough training and experience to handle crime instances, accidents and so on. Number two, the leadership they will have is something to be skeptical of.

For example, before the reserves were officially on duty an accident occurred at the Jaycee Fair. The reserves reacted very poorly, as expressed by many citizens. They did not have flares or any emergency equipment. They could not direct traffic and in fact they were causing more of a traffic hazard than anything else.

Their leader, Mr. Chief Greenstein, know-

ing of the performance and difficulties they were having without equipment and proper guidance, should never have voted for confirmation of the reserves. But he and three others, Jerry Cheske, John Flodin, and Carl Parsell, voted for them to hit the roads.

Yes, Carl Parsell, a man who is an executive director for the Police Officers Association of Michigan, working and representing certified officers; he too voted for them to be let loose.

Consequently, the first day they patrolled officially on the roads, a very bad accident occurred on Michigan Ave. and Sheldon road.

The reserves acted much the same as they did unofficially at the fair: very poorly. No flares and no know-how in directing traffic. When the Sheriff arrived they ran the reserves off because they were a detriment, not an asset.

So no matter which way we turn, this present administration has gotten us into a serious dilemma.

Leadership is reasoning and good judgment. And leadership is what we're paying for and not getting.

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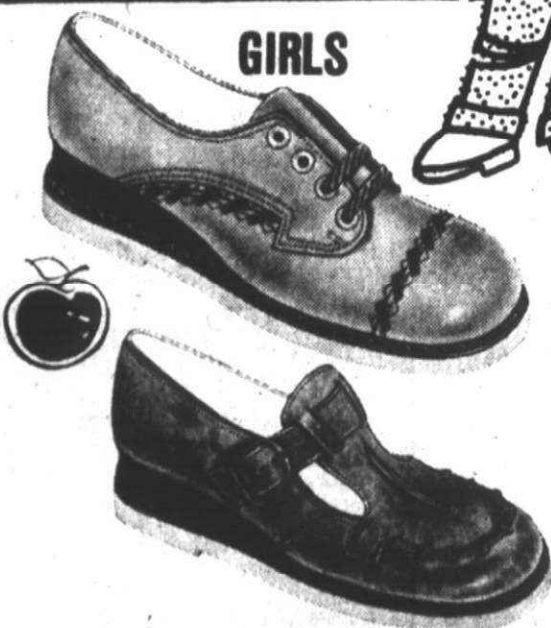
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Members of Concerned Parents work for millage

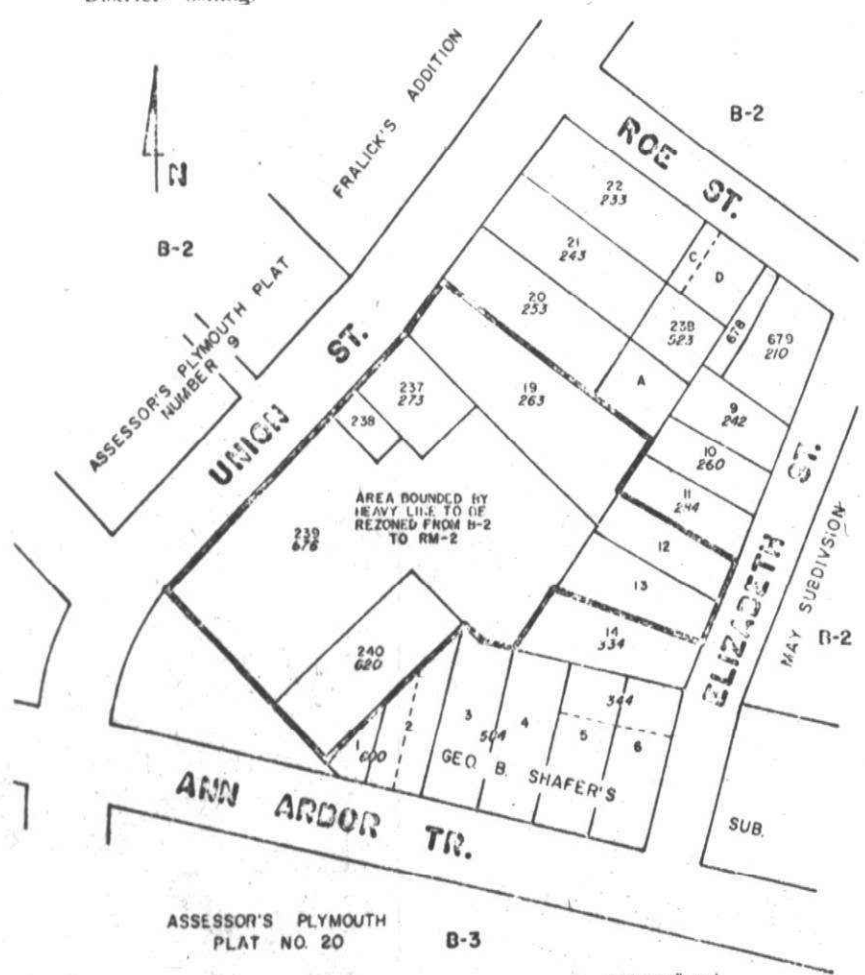

The 500,000 men and women who facilitate the purchase and sale of real estate across the nation have been profiled in a new study by the National Association of Realtors (NAR).

The general impression is that of an increasingly middle-aged group who changed occupations to enter the field and now work long hours to enjoy better than average incomes.

The survey of a cross section of the NAR membership drew responses from more than 2,600 real estate persons, generally brokers, and nearly 1,500 associates, usually licensed sales persons.

AS REPORTED by the United Northwestern Realty Association (UNRA), the survey found that 82 per cent of Realtors are men and that women now comprise 37 per cent of all full-time and 41 per cent of all part-time Realtor-Associates.

The median age of Realtors is 50 and that of Realtor Associates, 45. The study showed a trend toward increased schooling. A 1964 survey found about 40 per cent with only a high school education or less and that only about 30 per cent had completed four or more years of college.

The new findings showed fewer than 30 per cent had not achieved some college and that more than 40 per cent were college graduates. Similar percentages were revealed for Realtor Associates.

NEARLY FOUR of every five came into the profession from other occupations. Nearly half had been in allied fields such as sales, management and insurance. However, more than 22 per cent had been Realtors for 15 years or more with the median slightly over seven years.

The vast majority, some 60 per cent, spe-

cialized in single family use brokerages with commercial brokerages a distant second with eight per cent.

Most, 53 per cent, owned their businesses while more than 20 per cent were stockholders and corporate officers and some nine per cent partners in a business. Better than nine of 10 were not affiliated with a franchised operation.

THE AVERAGE WORK week was 50 hours with 31 per cent indicating they spent 60 or more hours a week on the job.

Median income for brokers is now \$24,000 annually, double the median income in 1963. Income was shown to rise with age and then decline in later years when less time may be devoted to the business.

The study also showed a positive relationship between earnings and formal education with one of four completing college graduate study earning at least \$50,000 in 1974. An associated rise in income also was noted relating to years of experience and hours worked each week.

While the findings for associates showed many parallels, they had a median income of \$12,000 working on a full-time basis but this rose sharply with years of experience.

These tips can make your move easier

A recent New Yorker cartoon depicts a rising young male executive earnestly announcing his resignation to a shocked boss because his wife is being transferred out of state.

Even though not all marriages today are that egalitarian, thousands of families will move this year to accommodate shifting corporate needs. And whether the husband's or wife's job takes precedence, someone in the family will have to overcome the initial shock to plan and manage the move, be it 25 or 2,500 miles.

The Careers for Women department of Northwood Institute, Midland, offers some tips for surviving the strains of geographic transition — not-so-obvious tactics to be taken before the move in addition to the routine, necessary arrangements for utility turn-offs, change-of-address notices to creditors, and others.

•Subscribe to newspapers and regional magazines as soon as you learn your new destination. A little pre-study on the real estate and job markets, schools, taxes and shopping prices will counteract the otherwise inevitable feelings of isolation in a new community.

•Try to schedule any medical, dental — even veterinary — checkups for the family before you move. You'll be too busy after the move and will tend to put off the hunt for new health caretakers. And can your present doctor, dentist or vet recommend a professional friend in your new community? Ask him or her for a copy of your records. Take-along is better than write and wait for!

•Take care of all necessary auto repairs — for two reasons. One, you'll want the car in tip-top shape to drive to your new location (especially if it's a considerable distance away.) Two, it can be inspected by the repair people you've patronized and trusted.

•Take advantage of special services which might not be available in your new area. For example, do some early Christmas shopping at your favorite, reliable factory outlet. Or frame those antique family photos at the do-it-yourself craft shop and avoid custom charges later on.

•If you're a teacher, nurse or plumber, learn what papers must be shuffled in order to be professionally certified in another state. You may not have to wait six weeks to substitute teach if you arrange for certification and anticipate the usual lead time before you move.

•Tell everyone about your big move. You never know whose uncle will run an ad agency in need of a new account executive or whose sister has three potential babysitters (daughters or sons) just waiting for you!

•Prepare your resume and have copies printed before you move. You'll have them ready to send at the hint of a job possibility. Also, you'll be in the proper, positive frame of mind, an utmost prerequisite to success.

•And while you're doing business with the printer, why not draft a simple "we've moved!" newsletter with all the details of your new address and job assignments; i.e., "John is spearheading a new marketing campaign for toaster-ovens in the Yukon...Mary's been made head basketball coach at State U...We're converting a 100-year old barn into new living quarters."

Send them to the many friends you've made in all your other moves. They'll love to hear from you. You'll avoid the gloomy prospect of transcribing the same message to thirty people. And with only one writing effort, just think of how many people will have to write back to you!

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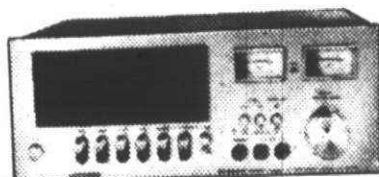

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Good news: No bad news on SATs at UM

Incoming freshmen at the University of Michigan appear to be brighter than last year's crop, according to the UM Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

The office reports an improvement in academic and Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) performance among the incoming group of students this year, following a decline last year.

Median scores on the SATs improved a total of 10 points over student scores last year, while the median high school percentile rank of the incoming students jumped from the 91st percentile last year to the 92d percentile this year.

Last year the admissions office reported a significant drop in the SAT test scores which corresponded to a nationwide decline. The College Entrance Examination Board, which administers the tests for college-bound high school juniors and seniors, has not yet published nationwide scores for incoming students this fall.

BASED ON THE 1976 admissions figures at UM, Clifford F. Sjogren, director of admissions, said he was "happy" to report that the recent decline in SAT scores for incoming UM students appears to have been reversed—at least for the time being.

Among all incoming first-year students at the UM Ann Arbor campus, the median score on the mathematics portion of the SAT jumped from 590 last year to 600 this year, while scores on the verbal portion remained the same at 520. The tests are scored on the basis of 800 as a perfect score.

The figures on incoming students at UM include students in the schools of art, education, music, natural resources, engineering, pharmacy, nursing, and literature, science and the arts.

Sjogren said the most noticeable increase this year in academic and test performance involved first-year students in nursing and pharmacy, and to some extent, engineering. He suggested that this is indicative of increased student interest in the health science professions and in professional schools in general.

CONSIDERING RECENT declining scores at UM and nationally, Sjogren said he felt it was "good news that we do not have bad news" this year.

In addition to the 10 point improvement in the median SAT math score, Sjogren reported improved academic and test performance by UM students in virtually all areas which are measured quantitatively. Some examples he cited are:

- The top 10 per cent of incoming students at UM scored over 650 on the verbal portion of the SAT, compared to 640 last year, and 720 on the mathematics portion, compared to 710 last year.
- The performance of in-state first-year students increased significantly: They posted a median SAT math score of 560 this

year, compared to 580 last year, and a median verbal score of 510, compared to 515 last year.

For out-state students three results were mixed: Their median math score jumped from 615 last year to 620 this year, but

their verbal score dropped from 545 last year to 540 this year.

•This year a total of 12.5 per cent of all incoming first-year students came from the top percentile of their high school classes, compared to 11.9 percent last year.

Schoolcraft faculty walks out on Grote

Virtually the entire Schoolcraft College faculty of 150-plus walked out of an orientation meeting Wednesday morning when President C. Nelson Grote declined to answer their questions.

Richard Arlen, president of the Faculty Forum, bargaining agent for the faculty, said instructors are dissatisfied with the lack of progress in contract negotiations and with Grote's "general attitude that the faculty is second and everything else is first."

A two-year contract expired Aug. 23. Faculty members are working under an extension of the old one, and that extension is to expire at midnight, Sept. 7.

Arlen said the walkout wasn't planned by the union but was either spontaneous or planned by instructors without the union's formal leadership.

A college spokesman said the meeting in the little theater opened at 10 a.m. and two deans announced personnel changes. Grote then started to speak, saying he would talk

from notes for about 45 minutes.

Counselor Ronald W. Rogowski then rose and asked Grote to engage in a dialog on matters of interest to the faculty—particularly the lack of a new contract and his evaluation of the faculty.

Grote said he wanted to continue his remarks as planned, according to the college spokesman. (Arlen added that Grote called Rogowski out of order.)

At that point, the faculty members all departed, leaving only administrators in the room.

Arlen said the feeling of unhappiness with the president's attitude "has been building up over a period of six years."

Negotiations on a new contract began in May, and about two or three meetings a week have been held since then. "We're about five per cent of the way to a new contract," said Arlen. "We don't have that many heavy issues on the table, and the faculty can't understand the lack of progress."

Minor parties appeal ruling

Although six minor political parties will have a place on November's general election ballot, their future in Michigan is shaky unless the U.S. Supreme Court declares a new state law unconstitutional.

An earlier suit filed in U.S. District Court on behalf of the parties by the American Civil Liberties Union was only partially successful. The suit challenged Public Act 94, a law requiring political parties to receive three-tenths of one per cent of the primary vote to be eligible for the general election ballot.

None of the minor parties involved (Socialist Workers, Socialist Labor, Communist, Communist Labor, U.S. Labor and Libertarian) received enough primary votes (3,600) to qualify under this statute.

A three-judge panel ruled last week that the parties would be placed on this year's ballot anyway, because the law was put in effect too soon before the primary to enable them to enlist voter support under the new conditions. However, the panel ruled the law would stand in future elections.

But according to Howard Simon, ACLU director, the suit will be appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court. "I think that the present requirement that parties collect 17,600 signatures on a petition to be placed on the

primary ballot is an adequate measure of voter support," Simon said.

"The court ended up weighing the convenience of the major parties and decided against the right of the public. Our constitutional rights have been limited by technology."

"Michigan has voting machines that can list a limited number of candidates. Public Act 94 was designed to preserve machine voting," Simon asserted.

Simon said he also believed it was unfair to expect the minor parties to go through the primary at all because they did not have competing candidates. Voters were asked only if they wished to see the party on the general election ballot.

He added, "Our experts say that 55 per cent of the electorate are independents. The major parties are bending over backward to keep their current option of straight party ticket voting. This hurts the minor parties."

"Forty-four states use the petition route (under which all but the Communist Party qualified for the primary). Michigan will be left with the most restrictive voting regulations in the country if the law stands."

Keith spends \$4,990 for renomination

State Rep. William Keith (D-Garden City) spent \$4,990 and raised \$5,195 as he won renomination in the 33rd District Aug. 3 in a three-way primary.

Edwin J. Markowicz of Garden City spent \$981 and reported no contributions to his campaign.

Arnold Lutz of Inkster spent and received \$323. He reported a contribution of \$100 from the Inkster Democratic Club and pumped \$118 of his own money into the primary.

Meanwhile, Aaron Butler of Inkster, unopposed in the Republican primary, reported no contributions or receipts.

All filed expense reports with the Wayne County clerk's election office.

KEITH'S COMMITTEE reported these contributions of \$100 or more:

School Alliance Political Action Committee (PAC), \$200; Dentistry Investing in Action on Legislation, \$175; Savings Association PAC, \$200; Michigan Banking PAC, \$350; House PAC of Chicago, \$100; Michigan Doctors PAC, \$100; Michigan Credit Union, \$100; Michigan Podiatry Action Association, \$100; and Real Estate PAC, \$300.

A fund-raiser brought Keith's committee \$3,371. Major contributors were: Daniel Knopper of Inkster, Michigan Chiropractic Association and Savings Association Public Affairs Committee, \$200 each; Ian A. Grassan of South Lyon, \$110; and Inkster Democratic Club, Robert J. Gregg, Dr. Fred Bianco of Garden City, Committee of Automotive Retailers, Construction Industry Management PAC and Roland Lubbinge of Grandville, all \$100 each.

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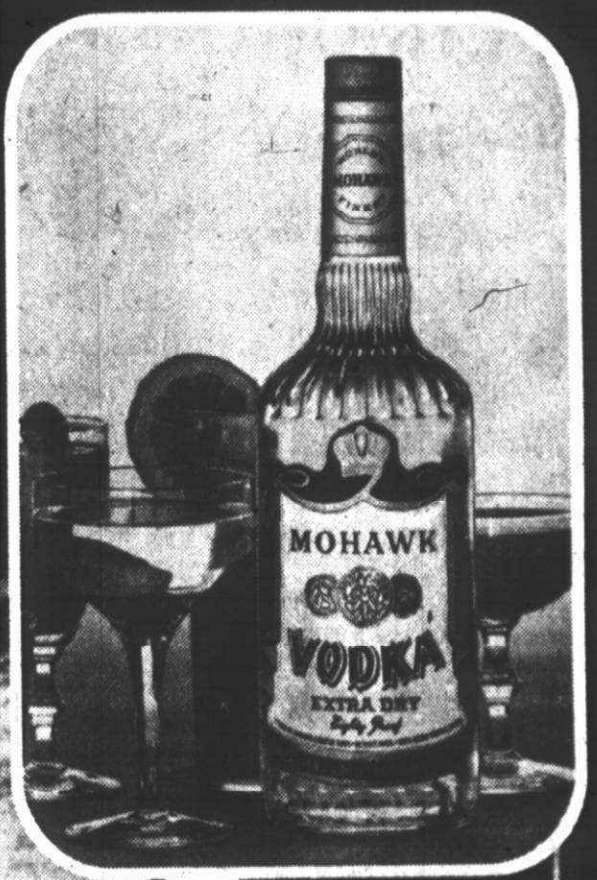


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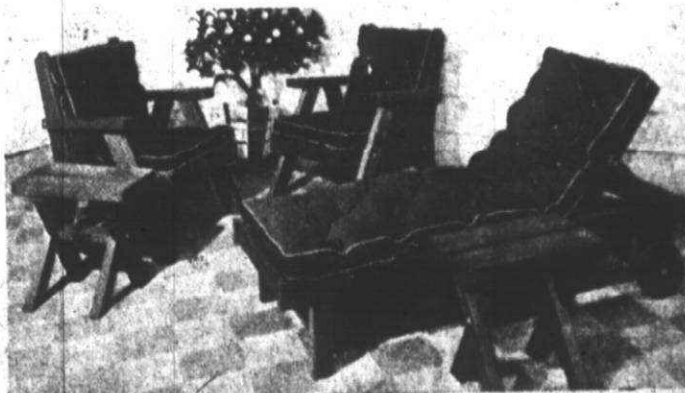


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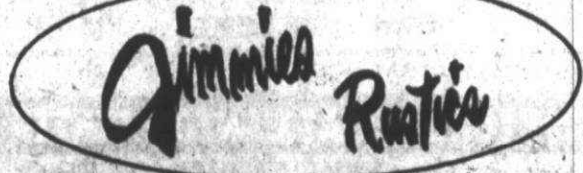


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Regional roundup

CITY WINS SHOWDOWN

The City of Livonia reported a victory in its showdown with the federal housing and urban development department (HUD) on how the city should spend funds for low-income family housing. The city administration argued its case in Washington on Monday, just one day before its application for \$590,000 was to be rejected. HUD said the city it won't have to build or plan to build new housing for low-income families this year. Instead, the city would move ahead with plans for senior citizens'

housing and when the occupants move in, their homes would be "freed up" for other families to move into.

CRIME BUSTERS

The Redford Chamber of Commerce, in cooperation with the Redford Kiwanis Club and police department, have begun monitoring a special citizens band radio frequency for emergencies transmitted by citizens band radio operators. The procedure makes every CB operator in the area a crime "reporter."

SCHOOL WOES FLARE UP IN GC

Garden City School District, the victim of a bitter 42-day teacher strike in 1974, is having problems once more. The Garden City Education Association (GCEA), inflamed by the board's recent release of teachers' demands, hasn't ruled out a strike. The board, plagued by the district's financial crunch and declining enrollment situation, maintains there's not enough money to meet the GCEA's exorbitant demands. The board is saying an impasse has been reached, while union members say they're flexible and ready to settle. The current teacher contract expires at midnight Aug. 31.

PRESNELL REAPPOINTED

Tom Presnell is expected to be reappointed as 20th District Wayne County Commissioner following a Michigan Appeals Court ruling last week which said his appointment in January was illegal because it was more than six months before the November regular election. Presnell filled the vacancy left when Tom Taylor became mayor of Westland. The 20th District includes Westland and Garden City.

LAWSUIT

A lawsuit seeking to stop the Canton Township reserve police patrols has been filed in Wayne County Circuit Court. The hearing will be at 2:15 p.m., Wednesday in Judge Thomas B. Sullivan's courtroom. The controversial armed, full-power reserve unit is opposed by the Wayne County Sheriff's union and political opponents of the present administration. Leonard Waszczeni is plaintiff in the lawsuit which was submitted to the court by defeated trustee candidate Noel D. Culbert.

LAWN JOB

Marcia Borowski, Plymouth Community School trustee, has said that school administrators should pay \$480 out of their own pockets for hiring a landscaping firm to keep up the administration building lawn. She says the lawn is "half the size of a postage stamp" and wouldn't be enough grazing space for a guinea pig.

MAGIC TRICKS VANISH

A local magician who also serves as ringmaster for Bozo on the children's television show had a misfortunate trick played on him. John Cummings, with offices in Plymouth and Farmington, returned from the magic convention in Colon, Mich., and left his car parked in the driveway with all his magic equipment in the back seat. When Cummings awoke in the morning, the car door was open and all his magic equipment gone. He is now offering a reward for the reappearance of his tricks of the trade.

SC accepts mail registration

Mail-in registrations for 150 community services fall courses at Schoolcraft College will be accepted through Aug. 30.

Courses, offered for individuals of all

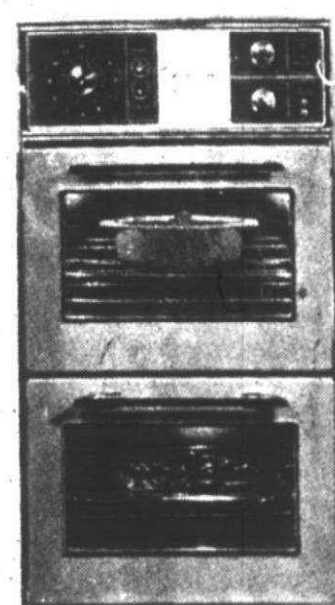
ages, include business, culinary arts, fine arts, health, home economics, technology, liberal arts, math-science, physical education and recreation, and social science.

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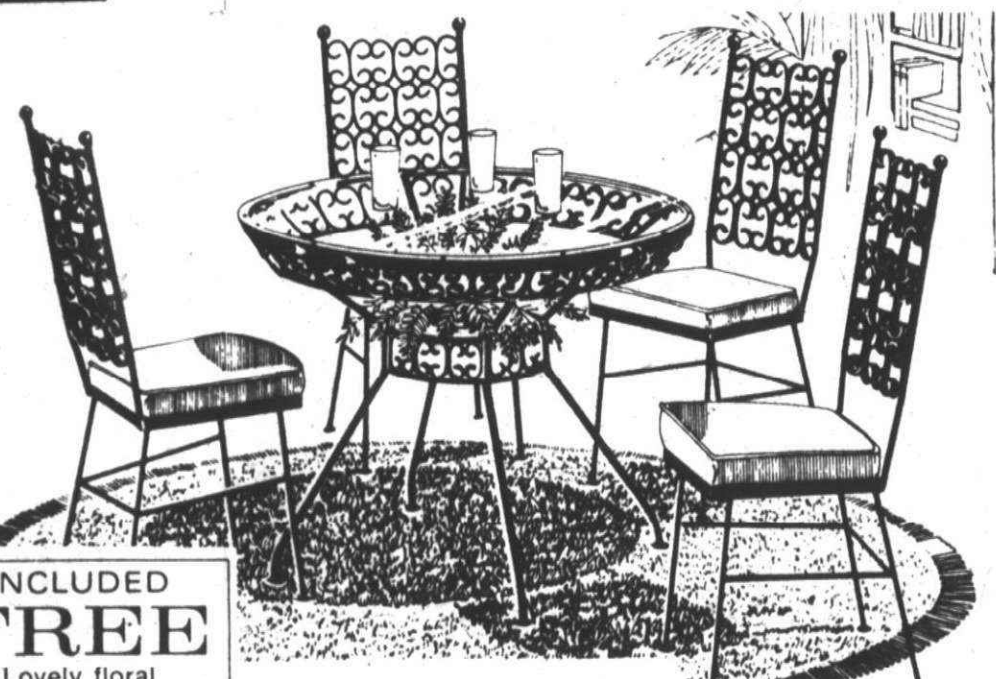
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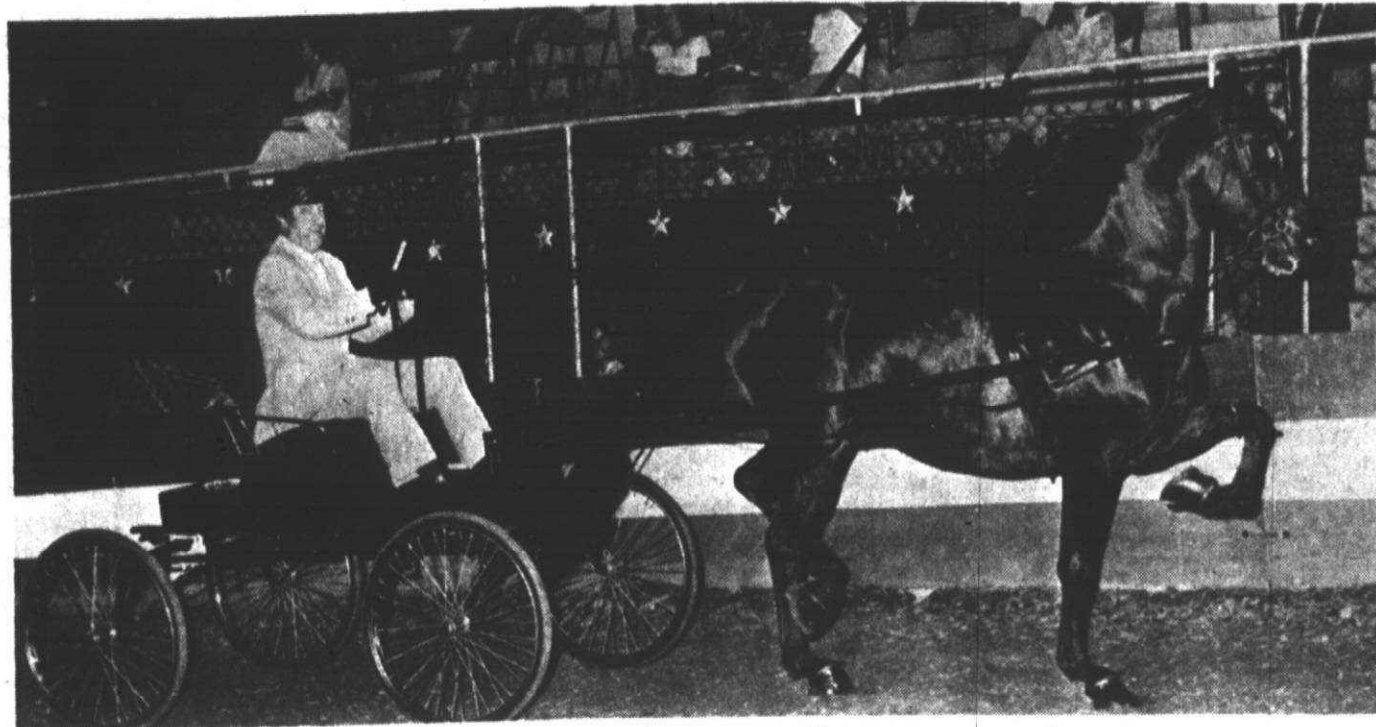


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Doc Fenkell wins trophy

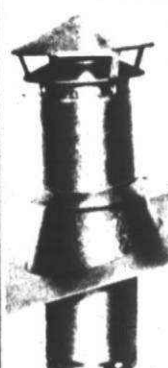
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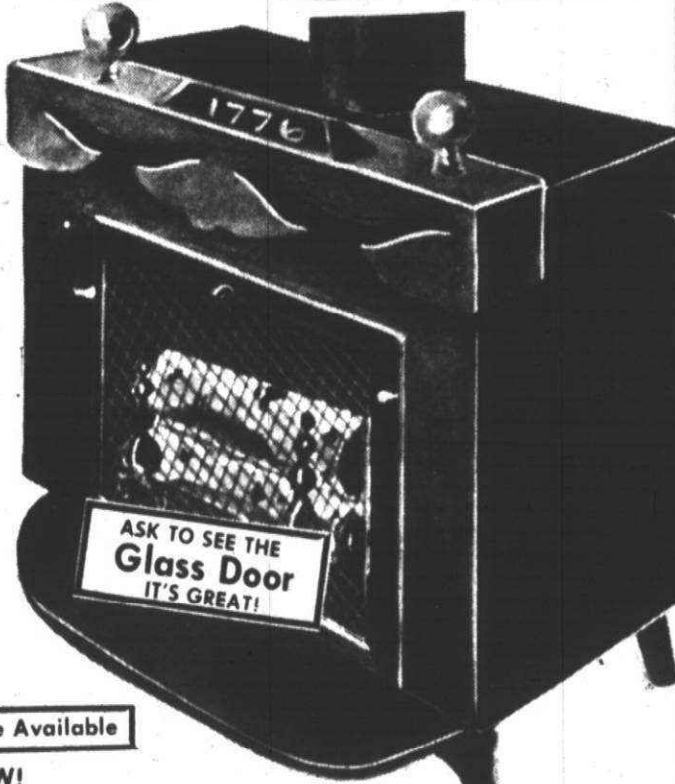
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Skywatch

September's harvest moon shines on

September brings the end of vacation, beginning of school, longer nights for skywatching and two specials: the autumnal equinox and the harvest moon.

The day the sun crosses the celestial equator from northern to southern hemisphere is called the autumnal equinox. On this day—at 5:38 p.m., Sept. 22—day and night are of equal length, and autumn officially begins for the northern hemisphere. What makes that great, romantic har-

vest moon (in October, it's called the hunter's moon) so special is that the full moons near the autumnal equinox seem to rise about the same time several nights in a row. This is due to the fact that the orbit of the moon around the earth is slightly tilted to the earth's equator, causing the appearance of moons rising at the same time.

THERE ARE several prominent planets this month. Just after sunset, Venus will be low in the western sky. On Sept. 25, the crescent moon will be very close to Venus. Mars will be too close to the sun to be

easily seen this month but you might find it with binoculars on the 10th, when it will be close to Venus. Jupiter rises about three hours after sunset and will dominate the eastern sky of the late evening. The ringed planet Saturn will rise in the east about three hours before sunrise. At the end of the month, if you're lucky, you might catch a glimpse of the elusive planet Mercury, low in the east just before sunrise.

The constellations this month reflect the change of seasons. The bright star in the west in the early evening is called Arcturus. It lies in the kite-shaped constellation Boötes, the herdsman. East of Boötes is the C-shaped pattern of stars known as Corona Borealis, the northern crown. And, east of Corona Borealis is Hercules, the famous strong-man of old. ALMOST OVERHEAD will be the

bright, blue-white star Vega in the constellation Lyra, the harp. Northeast of Vega is the cross-shaped constellation called Cygnus, the swan, with its bright star Deneb.

Southeast of Cygnus lies Aquila, the eagle, which contains the bright star Altair. Linger in the low southern sky is Sagittarius, the archer, whose principle stars form the pattern of the teapot. Well up in the east will be four prominent stars in a square or diamond shape that form the body of the flying horse Pegasus. North of the square of Pegasus lies a double row of stars that mark Andromeda, the princess.

Finally, the bright star Capella, the goat star, can be found low in the northeast along with four other stars in the shape of a pentagon that forms the constellation Auriga, the charioteer.

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Unemployment rate depends on recession

It could be the best of times or the worst of times in 1980. But a four-year unemployment forecast by the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations (ILIR) gives predictions for the future either with or without a recession.

According to Malcolm Cohen, director of ILIR, forecasts were made for areas that are prime sponsors of manpower programs throughout the state. In Wayne County, Livonia was one of the cities chosen for an individual forecast.

The optimistic version of the forecast predicts that Livonia's unemployment rate will average 6.1 per cent in 1976 and decline to 4.9 per cent in 1980. But if a recession should hit the area during the four-year period, the unemployment rate will be closer to six per cent in 1976, rising to 8.1 per cent by 1980.

But even in the depths of a recession, Livonia would be better off than Detroit, whose unemployment average could reach 20 per cent by 1980.

Wayne County in general will have an unemployment rate of 11.7 in 1976, declining to 9.1 per cent in 1980 if we don't have a recession, Cohen says.

"But if the economy does get worse, the unemployment rate could be as high as 14.9 per cent in 1980," he adds.

According to "Cohen, the predictions seem to be fairly accurate when compared to actual unemployment figures. The forecasts will be used in the preparation of plans submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor.

The institute is sponsored by the University of Michigan and Wayne State University.

Local arts funds available in fall

Michigan Council for the Arts, recently announced a change in the funding period for the community assistance program. The program grants up to \$1,000 for arts projects sponsored by nonprofit organizations. The new dates are Oct. 1, 1976 through Nov. 30, 1977.

Previously, the beginning date for projects in mini grants, artist-in-residence, consultant service, conference assistance and touring presentations was Dec. 1, 1976.

How will you use 2d chance?

The Plymouth School District property tax issue which lost by one vote last June will be back on the ballot Thursday with school supporters hopeful that this time a majority of residents will cast "yes" votes for 4.75 additional mills for operating.

Since June, budget cuts have been put into effect, and so a "no" vote won't result in any new cuts. The key now is that a "yes" vote will restore the drastic reductions which otherwise will face students the following week.

THE OBSERVER & ECCENTRIC endorsed the millage on the June ballot because we felt residents did not want to endure the type of cuts which would result from defeat. Nothing has changed since June to warrant anything but a "yes" vote Sept. 2.

The millage will mean about \$100 a year more in school taxes to the owner of a \$40,000 house. That may sound like a lot, but for many the cost of a "no" vote will be greater. Take, for example, a family which hires a babysitter to watch an elementary youngster after school lets out. The shortened school day caused by a "no" vote will cost about \$150 more over nine months for the sitter's wages.

Elimination of extra-curricular activities could mean many parents will be paying for other interest-type activities for youth—another price tag to consider.

Reduction in programs will definitely hurt quality of education here. If not reversed, this will have a negative impact on property values, and homeowners will lose equity which will financially hurt much more than paying out \$100 more per year.

Investing \$100 more per year in schools makes just as much sense as spending \$100 or more for a home security system to protect valuables. Valuables, once stolen, take time to replace, and some are irreplaceable. The same is true of educational programs—restoration takes time and for individual students complete restoration will never be possible.

We know from June's experience that every vote counts. Financially, your "yes" vote costing about \$100 will generate \$2 million for the school district—that's how many dollars your vote represents.

Without the \$2 million, results will be: shortened school days at all grade levels; reduction of extra-curricular affairs; larger class sizes (up to

36-1 pupil-teacher ratio); loss of reading specialists; loss of art, music and humanities programs at the elementary level; reduction in class offerings at the secondary level; and inadequate supplies and textbooks.

The \$2 million is necessary because of budget demands caused by increased growth in the district and because of cutbacks in state financial support prompted by Michigan's sick economy.

The demands created by growth include the opening of three new schools this year, plus the physical education-music wing of Plymouth Canton High, which will cost some \$400,000 just to turn the key—plus faculty.

Another demand is to meet the needs of the 800-plus new students who weren't in school last year.

To offer today's children the same education others have enjoyed, to protect our sound educational programs, to protect property values, and to meet the demands of growth are the major reasons why your \$100 and "yes" vote are needed.

What government giveth, it taketh away

What big government giveth, it can taketh away. Easily. Quickly.

There's nothing new about this, except that a whole slew of concrete illustrations hit these suburbs last week.

First, Gov. William Milliken vetoed \$199,000 which had previously been approved in the state budget for further rehabilitation of Wilcox and Newburgh lakes.

Close to Plymouth, Livonia and Westland residents, the lakes have been the subject of intensive study for many years, all of it directed toward making them real pleasure spots instead of mud holes.

Several months ago, the Wayne County Road Commission started building fishing docks and the hope was that the \$199,000 in the state budget would have paid for dredging and deepening the lakes.

"The governor was satisfied to put \$800,000 into the budget for the Pontiac Stadium subsidy," commented State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), who has been working for several years to improve the lakes, "and I don't know why the people who have been working on this project for years should be sidetracked."

IN THE same vetoing session, Milliken also canned an amendment to the state aid to education bill that would have provided extra money for suburban school districts with declining student en-

rollments. The amendment would have given some local school districts a hefty shot in the arm: Livonia was due to get \$160,000, Garden City \$71,000, and Redford Union \$30,480.

The basic problem is that the state aid to school district formula is set up on the basis of so much per student enrolled. But some suburban school districts are finding that as the sizes of families living in the district decrease over the years, the number of children enrolled in the school system has dropped. Garden City, for example, has a current enrollment that is 31 per cent less than it was in peak years; smaller percentage drops have been recorded by Livonia; and a number of Oakland County school districts, including Farmington, face similar problems.

Superintendents of affected districts met earlier this week to discuss what, if anything, could be done about the veto. Gerald Dunn, who lobbies for a number of local school districts in their attempt

to get the state to take a more understanding attitude toward their problems, attended the meeting. Options available to the school districts include an attempt to override the veto or resubmission of legislation next month. Don't bet on anything, though.

TURNING from state big government to the federal bigger government, we have the city of Livonia, which met early this week with officials from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to try to resolve a dispute in which the city could lose \$590,000 in federal funds.

Last week, a HUD official informed the city that it must provide many more low-income rental units than it had planned in an upcoming housing program. The city claims that it is in compliance with federal regulations requiring provision of low and moderate income housing in such projects; indeed, last year, the same HUD official who threatens to deny the Livonia application said that cities will be allowed to determine their own development priorities without interference from HUD.

AH, WELL. It's all in this week's news. Government can give, and it can take. If you don't want anything from the government, then you don't run the risk of it being taken away.

And the people in Lansing Washington are still wondering just why the natives are so restless.

Age of majority under twin attacks

Only four years after Michigan's age of majority was fixed at 18 years, for most purposes, the concept is under vigorous attack.

On one hand, the Detroit youth gang situation illustrates for the umpteenth time that persons of 13 or 14 can be depraved, vicious, hardened monsters. So there is legislative interest in writing new laws to allow persons below age 17 to be tried as adults and imprisoned.

On the other, there is pressure—as illustrated by Troy's city council—to raise the drinking age to 19. The idea seems to be that 18 year olds are buying the stuff and allow 14- and 15 year olds to drink.

The drive is being fed, as I pointed out last week, by the tricks the Michigan State Police are playing with drinking driver statistics involving the young.

A PERSONAL NOTE is in order here.

It was this writer, in the days of the old Observer Newspapers, who conceived the idea of asking Gov. Milliken to appoint what became the Governor's Special Commission on the Age of Majority. The commission proposed, the legislature passed, and Milliken signed a law that lowered the age of majority on most legal matters to 18.

The louts who write headlines at The Detroit News galled me when they continually referred to it as "the teen drinking bill." The bill covered not only drinking but pistol licenses, operation of recreation halls, rights to property, pari-mutuel betting, skilled trades licensing and a host of other subjects. The bill covered not just rights but responsibilities, too.

FRANKLY, I WAS surprised that the governor's commission, headed by a district judge and including a psychologist and other experts, had recommended a uniform 18 for the age of majority.

I expected the commission would recommend a number of different ages of majority—perhaps 14 for criminal responsibility, 15 or 16 for the age of female consent in statutory rape laws, 18 for males to marry without parental consent and 19 for drinking.

The Michigan commission, following the lead of a similar British commission a few years earlier, opted for a uniform age, however, and so I followed the lead of the experts.

One wonders today whether the experts were right or wrong.

THE POINT is this:

When voters decided on the 18-year-old vote as a state constitutional question, they rejected it—twice. When a state representative drafted bills for young people's bill of rights, he got nowhere.

But when a commission studied both rights and responsibilities, the governor and the legislature bought it. The moral of the story is that you cannot and should not look at one legal right or one legal responsibility in isolation.

If you're going to give young people the right to buy property, you've got to give them the responsibility to pay for their debts. If you're going to give them the right to vote, you've got to give them the duty to serve on juries.

If need be, Milliken should reconvene the Age of Majority Commission. The matter cries out for cool, rational study of the entire issue of what constitutes a responsible adult. The legislature shouldn't allow the age of majority bill to be hacked apart piecemeal.

How values get discounted

Remember in the old days you always used to go to the same neighborhood gasoline station and everyone called you by name? You paid more for your gas, but you were assured that if something went wrong with your car, there would be somebody to help you out.

Remember when you used to go to that little corner grocery store and the manager greeted you by name? You paid more for the groceries and, possibly, didn't have as great a selection, but the meat was cut to your order and you got personal attention; and if there was ever an emergency, you knew whom to contact.

Today the world has changed. In our great mobile system, we seem to be dominated by discount prices. We drive miles to save pennies. When organizations discount their prices, they must, of course, reduce their services to make up for the lost revenue.

ALONG THE SAME line, some manufacturing companies are so dedicated to the philosophy of giving business to the low bidder that they, in fact, hurt themselves in the long run.

Their suppliers, in competing to be low bidders, eventually go out of business because some fool, in order to get the business, bids less than cost. And then everybody lines up to follow, in order to get the big order.

Some suppliers still believe that if they lose a little on every job, they'll make it up in volume. After these suppliers are put out of business, prices go up with the lack of competition.

WHILE DESIRING to maintain a profit for their shareholders, the automobile companies have been guilty of putting many small companies out of business in the Detroit area in their search for the low bid—which sometimes means that the bidder who made a mistake in estimating gets the job.



August—our blessed season

Thanksgiving and Christmas get most of the publicity, because they can be better exploited commercially. But Michigan is most blessed at this season, late August and early September, when the livin' and eatin' are the best of the year.

Has there ever such a delicacy is sweet corn, which Hiawatha called Mondamin? Boiling it five minutes is the fastest way to enjoy it. But the best method is to pick it absolutely fresh, peel the outer husks, soak the inner husks and roast over a charcoal fire. It's literally sweet, and zealots often make an entire meal of it.

And you never really know what tomatoes taste like until you get them at this time of the year. Yellow beans, like Mondamin the corn, taste literally sweet when you eat them minutes after picking. Squash is coming onto the market. Salads spring to life with fresh cucumbers so that you hardly need a commercial dressing. The latest fad in our office is opening pea pods and plucking out raw peas and eating them like peanuts.

There is no taste at any time of year so incredible as a fresh peach. Sure, you can put it in a pie or slice it up over ice cream or garnish it any number of ways—but you don't need to. Michigan's plums are savory and delightful, and the melon list boggles the mind.

The first apples are in, and while their taste isn't as sweet as the later ones will be, it seems like you've waited months for something so good. Cider is here, and will be around until February: Cold, sweet, lively on the tongue.

You could almost make a breakfast of the fruit and a dinner of only vegetables, but there's no need to cut out a protein dish entirely. Maybe the trout from Sebowisha the brook isn't biting and Maskenozha the northern pike is sulking. But Shawondasee the wind from the south blows the bait into the fish's mouth when that fish is Sahwa the yellow perch or Ugudwash the bluegill. Roll 'em in breadcrumbs and be sure that skillet is smoking hot, then fry 'em fast until they're golden brown. No turkey or steak can compare!

Clouds do rollicking leaps and bounds and somersaults in the northern and western skies as the day wanes, and we see the most spectacular sunsets of the year; almost night after night. Little league season is over, and Dad's business gatherings are at a minimum, so the whole family is together oftener than at any other month of the year. We give thanks, and Gitchee Manito, God of the red and the white, the yellow and the black, is more pleased than he will ever be, even though there's no formal holy day on the calendar.

While it is true that the vehicle did make it to the moon, we have all had experiences with low bidders and discounters that leave something to be desired. If we base our world on reliance on the low bidder and discounter, our world will lose an awful lot of quality in life.

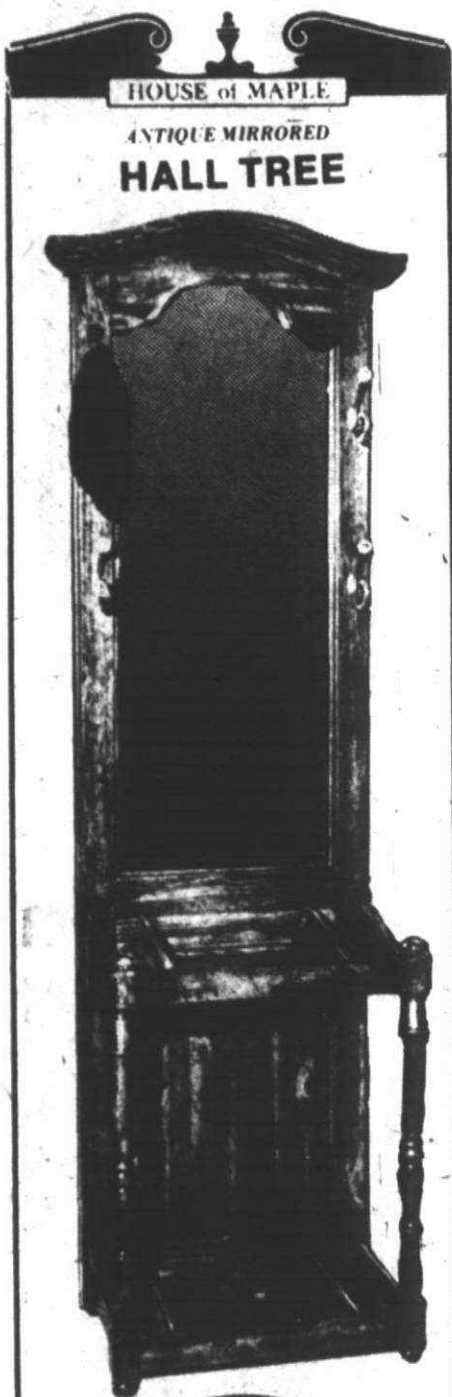
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Bilingual education is new goal

The notion that America is one big melting pot for all ethnic groups and races has been around for a long time. But, as in any recipe, the final brew is pretty poor stuff if the special quality of each ingredient isn't mixed in properly.

One of the best places to do the blending is in school, and a state law is helping it along. The law requires school districts enrolling 20 or more students who speak the same native tongue and have limited English-speaking ability to establish a program of bilingual instruction.

An amendment to the bill, now before the state legislature, would allow any parent, English- or non-English-speaking, to place a child in a bilingual instruction program.

THE TWO-YEAR-OLD LAW has several unique properties. According to Bill Vorhauser of the state's office of equal education opportunities: If a school system doesn't offer a bilingual education program, an eligible student may go to another school which does. The student's own school district must pay tuition and provide transportation.

And if the parents speak English but want their child to become bilingual, they theoretically have the right to place the child in a bilingual program under the same provisions as a student with a non-English speaking background.

"However the letter of the law and the spirit of the law sometimes differ," Vorhauser cautions. "To place a child in a program that emphasizes teaching English to a student with a foreign background rather than teaching a foreign language to a student with an English background would present a difficult teaching problem."

THE REAL PURPOSE of bilingual education, according to Vorhauser, stems from a treaty the U.S. made with Mexico in 1871 that guaranteed Indian and Spanish peoples absorbed into the new nation the

right to retain their own religion, language and culture. "These people are not un-American, but American by assimilation," he says.

"It is the idea of legislators and educators to approach bilingualism through a transitional process. Schools owe it to these people to maintain their language and culture," Vorhauser adds.

Although the intentions of legislators and educators seems admirable, they still have a few problems to solve that go beyond the law's original purpose. Very little money has been appropriated to carry out the law and educational methods for this kind of program are new to many teachers.

The only bilingual program in the area to receive more than a token amount of state funding is shared by the school districts of Birmingham, Southfield, and Oak Park. But according to Mike Labay, director of planning and evaluation for Birmingham schools, the state grant of \$44,000 which has been approved for the program this year is a cut from the \$75,000 granted last year.

The three districts are funded for bilingual instruction because they have a high percentage of Arabic-speaking Chaldeans. "We have over 300 Chaldean students in the three districts and at least 60 of them in Birmingham alone need help," Labay says.

"The state money will be used to underwrite tuition for teachers who must take classes at Mercy College to qualify for a bilingual teaching endorsement, to pay for the program's director and for materials," he adds.

KENNETH COGSWELL, language arts coordinator for Livonia schools says the district also receives a small amount of state funding although it does not have 20 students in any separate language category to call for a formal bilingual program. "Our largest two groups in terms of need are Arabic and Yugoslavian," he says.

According to Cogswell, the money will be used to buy materials like bilingual dictionaries.

Other school districts, like Wayne-Westland and Plymouth, do not receive state funding but do attempt to educate students with non-English-speaking backgrounds.

WHETHER THEY GET state money or not, programs at area schools seem to be branching out from classes like "English for the Foreign Born" into programs that emphasize the culture as well as language of participants.

Josephine Sarafa, head teacher of bilingual instruction for Birmingham schools, describes some of the teaching methods employed in the program: "We take children in very small groups. For instance, at Grove School we have three classes—one teaching basic English, one for the more advanced emphasizing grammar and written English, and one with a bilingual approach to social studies and government."

She adds, "In addition, the teachers work with students on an individual basis in sessions that range from half an hour to two hours a day."

"We've found that the problem with these students is usually in language areas, and there aren't so many communication difficulties in math and science

fields. Although many of the Birmingham students do know English because they were born in this country, they don't pick up a good quality of English unless it is through the school."

Mrs. Sarafa says this approach to bilingual education has been very successful. "The program has had a number of children of high school age who would have dropped out if the program hadn't helped them get through school, and a lot of children wouldn't have gotten promoted without help."

"We probably saved the taxpayers a lot of money that would have gone to students repeating a grade. Our services really come very cheap," Mrs. Sarafa says. "The main goal, she says, of the program is 'to teach these children to live simultaneously in two different cultures.'"

THE WAYNE-WESTLAND school district plans to go about bilingual instruction in the same manner that foreign languages are taught to English-speaking students. Frank Higgins, assistant superintendent of instruction for Wayne-Westland schools, says, "The teachers will point to something like a door, give the English word for it and work their way up."

According to Higgins, students with English problems will be given instruction four hours a week on a 38-week basis. "The classes are split by age group rather than language background and will meet at one central school rather than sending a teacher around to each school," he says.

This program, which receives no state funds, will cost the district about \$6,000, Higgins says.

PLYMOUTH SCHOOLS bilingual program is unique in that it was started to help out a Vietnamese family with nine children.

William Lutz, principal of Smith Elementary, says, "The project has been on a trial-and-error basis. We try to make a concentrated home and school effort. The kids have to speak English at home, so we get the parents' cooperation."

The Vietnamese children have a tutor who works with them using a conversational approach. "The main problem was

getting the children to respond," Lutz says.

TEACHERS IN THE area are becoming more aware of the kinds of problems and teaching methods encountered through bilingual children by attending workshops at local colleges. Teresa Marshall, a Livonia resident who teaches French and Spanish at Borgess High School in Redford, was a participant in a summer bilingual education workshop at University of Michigan-Dearborn.

"I haven't run into any bilingual students at Borgess, but I wanted to know how to deal with them," she says.

"The (UM-D) class visited several schools to observe their programs for bilingual students, and made up interviews for such students that would help reveal special problems. I found that there is a lot of conflict between home and American society values for these children. They should not have to lose their pride or self-esteem in their background just to learn English."

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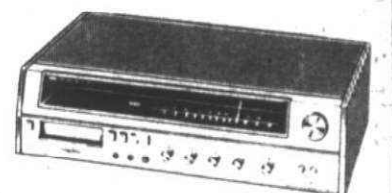
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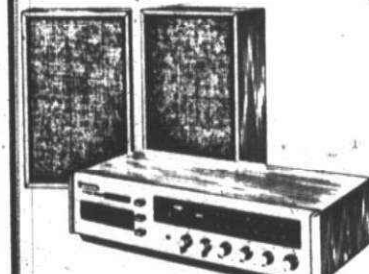
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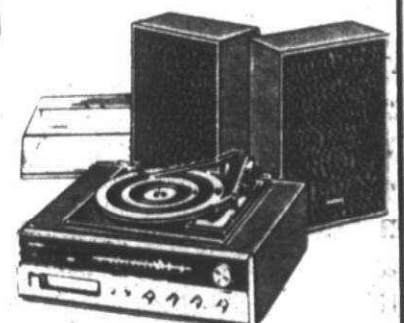
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Keep your cool—it's key to development

Heavenly, spiritual things are shown on this card, as are things of an earthly, material nature.

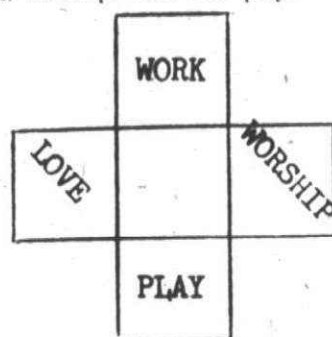
SOME TAROT decks picture irises growing on the bank of the pool. These flowers are named after the Greek goddess Iris, whose symbol was the rainbow, a beautiful

Business study determines SBT

An in-depth survey of Michigan businesses will have a major role in determining the future of the state's new single business tax.

The survey is being conducted by the Governor's Task Force on the SBT and will provide the factual data for its recommendations on possible changes in the much-debated tax structure.

State Sen. Robert Davis (R-Gaylord), a member of the task force, said the survey would be mailed to a cross section of Michigan business firms with a request that it be completed and returned.

The task force survey constitutes the first carefully coordinated statewide attempt to ascertain the exact repercussions of the SBT at all levels of business.

Sen. Davis said he intends to push the task force for recommendations by the end of September. He said that would allow for corrective legislation to act on this fall.

"It's important that we come to sensible conclusions, but that we do it quickly," said Davis. "I remain convinced that the SBT as presently written is having a harmful effect on business and jobs in Michigan. I view the work of the task force as determining what changes need to be made in the SBT not if the changes need to be made."

Davis earlier surveyed some 100 businesses in his 37th Senate District.

"That informal study indicated a heavily adverse impact on small businesses, particularly in tourist and other personal service industries," he said.

Based on those results, a public hearing and contacts with business people around the state, Davis has become the leading advocate of immediate changes in the SBT.

If the apparent increased burden on many small businesses can't be lightened rapidly, Davis contended, the new tax formula should be repealed while the program is thoroughly reviewed.

"I realize that we need a detailed statewide evaluation to measure the total impact of the SBT," said Davis. "This survey should allow the task force to make intelligent recommendations based on precise data on the extent and the distribution of the impact of this tax."

The study is being conducted by a Michigan polling organization, Market Opinion Research. They have constructed a scientific sample of 4,000 companies representative of the various types and sizes of businesses in Michigan.

National list matches students to rural jobs

The registry is mailed to more than 35,000 potential employers across the country. Any employer in a rural area with a job to fill may also list with the registry. The service is free.

Foster care—the beginning of a road back

Residents of the adult foster care home operated by John Wiltzie occasionally argue over who gets the morning paper first, but it doesn't bother him a bit. In fact, he thinks it's a healthy sign.

That's because the 14 adults who live in his large brick house in the rural part of Canton Township all are former residents of institutions.

So any time they shake off their institutionalism and take an interest in current events, Wiltzie feels that he, his staff and his home are doing just what the doctor ordered.

The doctor, in this case, is the Michigan Department of Social Services, which licenses and regulates all adult foster care facilities. Right now it is trying to increase the number of private homes and find more people to do what Wiltzie is doing.

To do this, the Wayne County Department of social services has set up a home finder unit, and Dorothy Steinberg talked about the reasons.

"PEOPLE ARE BEING released from institutions because they are no longer in need of institutional care," she said.

"But they still need after-care service, supervisory care and re-education to independent living. And they need guidance and help in attaining this goal."

"The small family home gives them a feeling of belonging and security and the chance to learn individual responsibility."

While Wiltzie's home is not small—it was originally a nursing home run by his father—it is in a position to do just this. He has seen the results of institutionalism and thinks that the story of Mary epitomizes what he is trying to do.

"The people who live here have been in institutions more than 30 years," he began. "They only know the institution. They talk, walk and live institution. We try to take away that depersonalization, give them a family and have them experience a more normal situation."

MARY, HE SAID, came to his home after 29 years in Northville State Hospital. "When she first came she was 61, and she fought a lot," he continued. "She didn't get along. She had a lot of rough edges. It seemed as though in the institution she fought every day for survival."

"She carried her purse all the time because of fear of theft. She ate fast and still does, so no one could take her food away from her. She seemed very dehumanized."

Mary has lived at the Wiltzie home about 10 months now.

"Her behavior has changed a lot," he claimed. She's a more social person. She doesn't fight as much, and seems to care more for her fellow man. She still carries her purse, but not all the time. She is more outgoing."

A FEATURE of life at the Wiltzie home is having to do certain jobs on a regular basis, and Mary's job is to help with the dishes and put them away.

"It's become her domain," said Wiltzie. "She loves it. After every meal she is there. She smiles more. She shops, and can buy her own clothes. She goes to church and really enjoys it."

He also noted that institutions tend to spoil people by making all their decisions for them, whereas a place like his has to concentrate on teaching them to function on their own.

Charlotte Simon, a Wayne County social worker in charge of this particular home, added a comment.

"People are more comfortable in surroundings like this," she said. "When they are more comfortable and feel they are living in an extended family home situation, they have a feeling of acceptance. They have someone to talk to."

"They understand someone cares for them," interjected Mrs. Steinberg. "They receive plenty of tender loving care."

SOME RESIDENTS in the Wiltzie home live two to a room. "We try to match people," he said. "It's hard, but we do the best we can. If it doesn't work out, we change them."

In addition, he has one large room for four men and another for three women. He also has the usual kitchen, living and dining rooms. On a patch of his 60 acres, the residents can garden. There are also chairs for outside sitting, and a hound dog named Blue to wrap up the home-like atmosphere.

For providing this home, Wiltzie receives either \$298.50 or \$228 a month, per resident, depending on the level of care that has to be administered.

The money might come from several sources, the individual's own income and

state and federal funds distributed by the Social Security Administration under the Supplemental Security Income.

The residents each receive \$27 per month for their personal use.

For its money the state is getting the building, grounds, food, transportation and other services for these residents, explained Helen Burton, adult community placement specialist from the state social services department in Lansing.

"We depend on people like John to provide us with places for them," she added.

WILTIE, who lives on the premises, is aided by Steve Duff, resident supervisor

and Duff's wife, Marcel, who cooks and is the all-round general helper.

To equip himself to deal with job he has undertaken and to keep his license, Wiltzie each year takes a training class in adult foster care at Wayne State Community College, for which he receives college credit.

His employees will also be taking courses in this field.

Why does he take on these 14 responsibilities?

"I do it for the reason anyone does anything," he replied. "I enjoy it. I've done something for my fellow human beings. It's a big challenge."

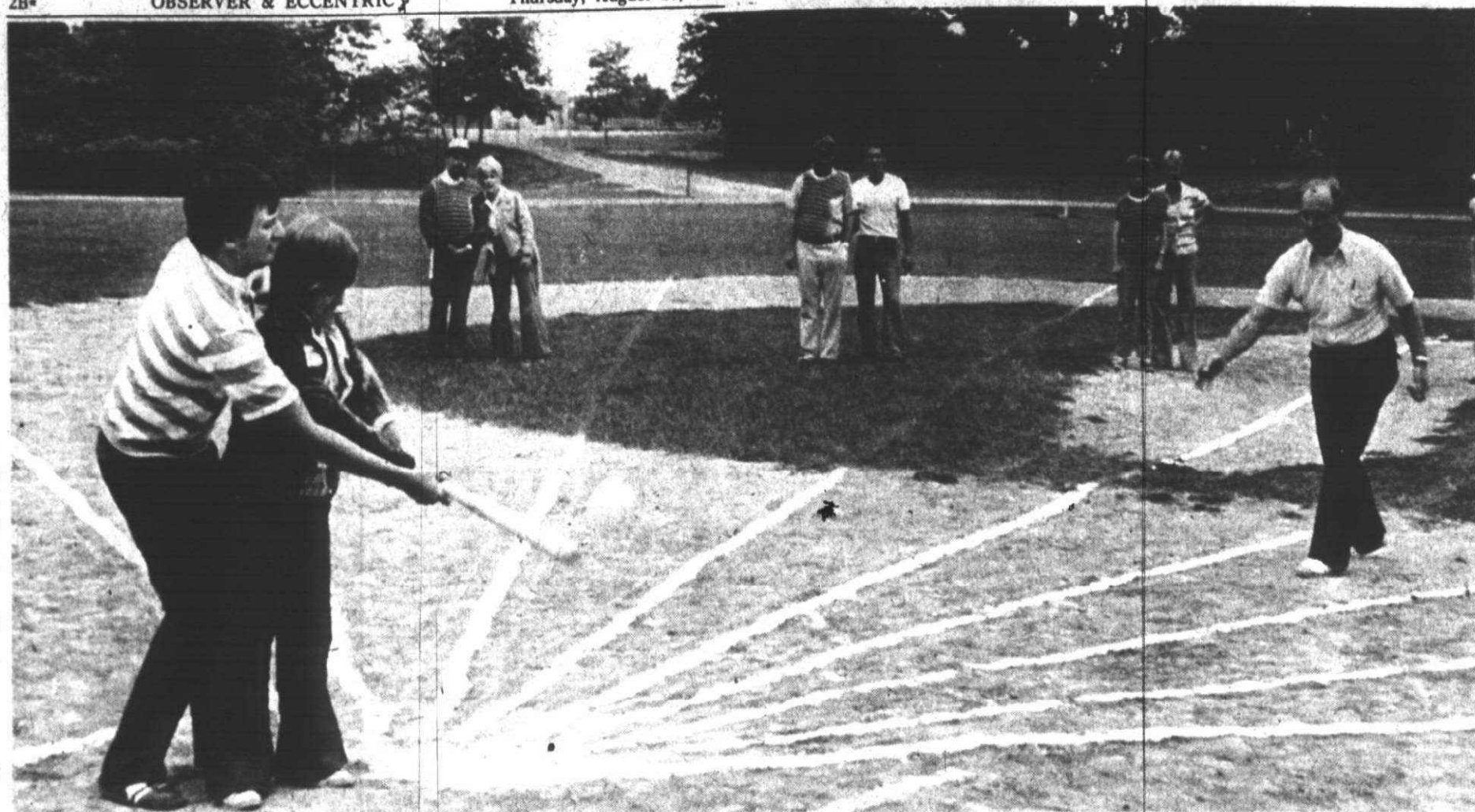

Baseball beeps so blind can play

What kind of baseball is this? The first base sends out a signal, the ball also goes "beep, beep" and the fans are absolutely silent when the batter hits the ball.

But this is the way blind young people played the game recently in a hotly contested match in Hines Park.

A picnic for the blind had been arranged by the Southeastern Michigan Lions Club. The ball game was run by the Fort Council of the Telephone Pioneers of America, whose members live in Livonia and other area cities.

Baseball for the blind was invented by a member of the Telephone Pioneers, which is a national organization. It is a game which the blind literally play by ear.

PICTURE the field. Made like a fan, the playing area is divided into seven wedges. In each stands a blind player and a seeing helper.

A seeing pitcher pitches the soft ball to the blind batter, who must locate it by its beeping sound. If he hits it, the audience must be silent while the fielders try to locate the ball in their wedge, and the batter makes tracks for first base.

The base, an organ cone, stands before him like a beacon on a lighthouse, except sound instead of light issues from it. Because the people in the stands are being quiet, the batter makes his way toward the sound.

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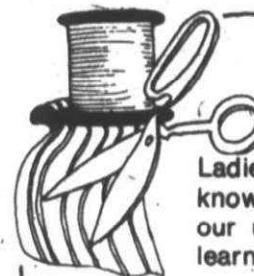

Christians in counseling organize

Dr. Harold Ellens, who has just returned from "the most effective" convention of the Christian Association for Psychological Studies will host the next quarterly meeting of the local chapter in University Hills Center in Farmington.

CAPS is described as "a professional society of Christian professionals in the helping professions" and drew 1,000 of its members to the international meeting last month in California.

The local chapter, which includes all of southeast Michigan, is headed by Dr. Norbert Anderson, who operates Anderson Counseling Associates in Farmington.

Dr. ELLENS said a "growing trend for the clergy to take on the professional role, through training, as a clinical therapist," accounts for the growing CAPS membership. The organization is made up of professionals in psychology, psychiatry, medicine, the clergy, sociology, social work, guidance, rehabilitation and such related fields.

Its aim is to help those professional coop-

erate in the search for a better understanding of interpersonal relationships, and to integrate a "Christocentric frame of reference" within these disciplines, Dr. Ellens said.

"Our meetings are not restricted to members. We invite everyone who is interested," Dr. Ellens said.

The program set for September, "will probably include a professional paper or two and some new films on psycho-therapeutic techniques," he said and added: "The whole purpose is to import new information and exchange ideas."

Dr. Ellens serves as executive secretary for the international group and says he has derived "three or four significant values" from his membership.

He called the forum for working out theory and sharing key creative ideas a "great stimulation." He said he has gained great insights from the mutual sharing of ideas and has benefited from the CAPS publications and the CAPS sponsored research programs.

"CAPS IS INTERESTED in basic university psychological research, having to do with rats and mice, for example, and we're interested in clinical research, the record keeping, data collecting, which give new insights into therapeutic techniques," he said.

"CAPS is also concerned with theological and Biblical research that relates in some honest way to the psycho-dynamics of human personality."

CAPS has just published "Self Esteem," a monograph that is the first in a series of ten on related themes.

Dr. Ellens said he would be contributing to the fourth book in the series, on the same subject he talked on at the recent convention, "Psychological Processing and Christian Experience in Psychotherapy."

He has just completed "Worship and the Christian Way," which will be going to press in September.

He's the son of a Methodist minister inspiring his family to continue the rituals his father taught him.

Spreading the gospel word through evangelistic music, the Dan Greer family of Westland organized themselves into what many consider the religious version of the Partridge Family.

It began four years ago when Greer and his wife Joan heard their oldest daughter, Lori, sing.

"Her voice was unusually strong for her age so she began singing with us in church," said Greer.

Since then the other children joined in and the Greer's have become the gospel-singing family of Westland.

"We perform in churches all around southern and central Michigan," said Greer, "mostly in the Flint, Saginaw and Jackson areas."

A PROFESSIONAL organist, Greer began singing duets with Joan and playing the organ in church concerts long before the family got into the act.

The children are Lori, now 17, Danny, 15; Lynda, 12, and small Dougie, 7.

"Something Good Is Going to Happen to You," "All God's Children," and "Family of God" are among the songs the Greer family sing together.

Greer said to add variety to the religious concerts each child has a special talent.

"Danny plays the trumpet and bass guitar, Lynda and Lori sing solos and duets,

and Dougie's little antics adds a bit of comedy to the performance," said Greer. "The audience just seems to eat it up."

Lynda's hopes to extend her interest in music and church is evident in her future plans.

"I hope to marry a pastor and sing in the choir," she said.

On the other hand, Dougie wants to be a race car driver.

"Singing Christian songs is fun—for some of the time," he said.

WITH FOUR CHILDREN constantly in and out of the house, practice sessions aren't held often in the summer.

"That's because we don't perform often in the summer," said Greer. "But once the school year begins, I'll be more strict about practicing."

Greer said church concerts allow the family to travel on weekends and socialize with people from various backgrounds.

"This is a rich experience for all of us," he said. "We keep in touch with many host families and invite them to our home."

Having done extensive work in evangelistic music with the Ford Philpot Evangelistic team—second only to Billy Graham—Greer's love for gospel singing has taken up most of his professional and leisure time.

"I've travelled with Ford Philpot for 23 years," he said, "and now he uses me sparingly for various crusades."

They plan to be married Oct. 9 in Our Lady of Good Counsel.

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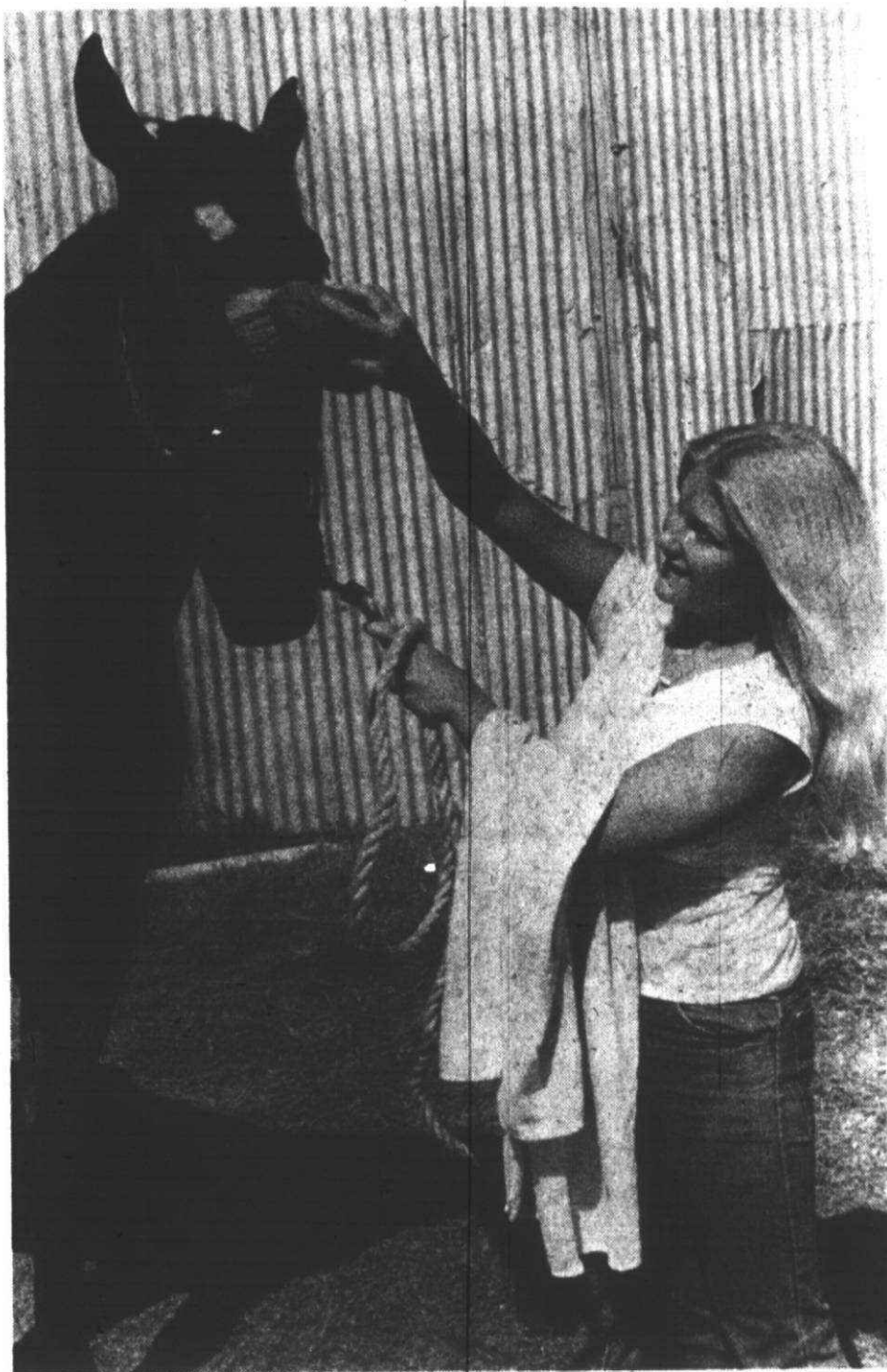

Don't can with microwaves

A microwave oven cannot be used for home canning according to Michigan State University.

Low acid foods need to be processed at 240 degrees; a microwave oven only goes to boiling temperature.

Even acid foods need the uniform heat provided by a conventional waterbath canner. A microwave oven would not assure consistent heat to each jar during processing.

Blanching fresh vegetables in a microwave oven prior to freezing can be done, however whether vegetables are blanched in a microwave oven or by the conventional method, the blanching times are about the same.

For exact blanching times in a microwave oven, contact, the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service at 858-0904, Mondays through Fridays, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Ask for the food preservation consultant.

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
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Film takes intimate look at sanity

The Reel Story

Soon after Ingmar Bergman completed "Face to Face" he was arrested by Swedish tax officials, grilled for hours, harassed and threatened. As a result, he suffered a nervous breakdown.

The film's theme was prophetic for Bergman. "Face to Face" is about sudden mental illness brought on by multiple undefinable pressures, sheer helplessness in the face of emotional onslaught, nameless terrors bursting the dikes of reason and restraint, releasing a flood of long-harbored anxiety and anguish.

The film is about a capable and seemingly well-adjusted individual's failure to cope with her unfulfilled needs and longings. With no typical neurotic outlet to assuage her raw feelings, she reacts with hysteria, fear, shame and attempted suicide. Her final recuperation is a return to her routine without real understanding about what happened. In her recovery lie the seeds of future troubles.

Consummate actress Liv Ullmann, who has seldom been better, magnificently plays central character Jenny Isaksson, a psychiatrist, wife and mother. Her husband, also a doctor, is in America at a professional convention; her daughter is at summer camp. A new house is being built and in the interim Jenny moves in with her grandparents.

IN THE SENTIMENTAL way grandparents will do, they decorate Jenny's old room with her childhood furniture. Grand-

ma fusses and directs as she used to doing for her ailing husband who is partially paralyzed by a stroke. Jenny finds the atmosphere anything but nostalgic. It is stifling and terrifyingly evocative of past suppressed memories, fears and unresolved uncertainties.

Significantly, Jenny's profession is one of helping the disturbed. Almost everyone in the film is either a doctor or a patient, and at times they are one and the same. It is a curious closed society Bergman shows as a microcosm of our own.

Jenny's patients are people with mysterious troubles and unpredictable temperaments. She is often in conflict with illness of unknown cause and without cure. When Jenny begins to have her own crisis, childhood agonies lurking behind her facade of composure—the epitome of mature adulthood—begin to ooze out uncontrollably. She cannot forgive herself this; as a psychiatrist she feels she ought to know the pitfalls of mental breakdown and avoid them.

Like a haunted woman, Jenny is pursued by a symbol of death, an old withered woman. Stern, accusatory, the face of the image is wrinkled as much by bitterness and severity as it is with age, her left eye is a black and gaping empty socket. Whenever Jenny looks into a mirror the old crone is behind her shoulder, hovering like

an evil demon, a creature from a private hell.

JENNY MEETS TOMAS, a physician and half-brother to her most difficult patient. The character is subtly and sympathetically played by Erland Josephson who is Ullmann's husband in "Scenes from a Marriage."

It is to Tomas that Jenny goes for companionship and understanding after she is almost raped. She tells him her secret shame at desiring to be violated by the stranger, though her own rigid body has prevented it.

Jenny's mounting tensions results in extreme physical reaction and she becomes hysterical. Desperately she tries to hold her mind in check, minute by minute, to retain her sanity long enough for the the panic to pass. Her psychological damage is manifested in convulsions. Tomas can offer only moral support and prevent her from regressing into a fetal position. She must pass through the fires alone.

Jenny sleeps the sleep of oblivion for several days. When she is finally awake she tries to commit suicide by calmly swallowing a bottle of sleeping pills. "I'm not afraid or lonely or even sad," she whispers to herself. "In fact, it feels rather nice." Like a child Jenny sings herself to sleep as her finger laboriously traces the patterns in the wallpaper.

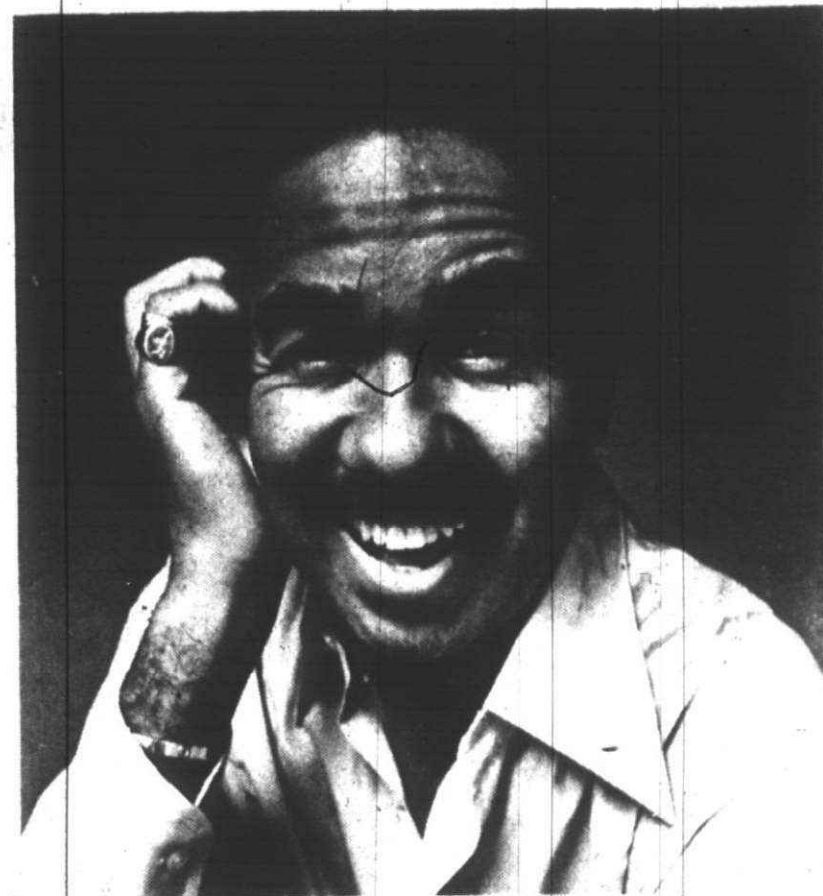
Jenny slips down into a dream world. Dressed in red cap and robe, she wanders through memories of her broken and suppressed past which have tormented her. Symbols of lovelessness, loneliness, failure and panic repeatedly run through her cycle of sleeping and waking nightmares.

JENNY SEES a coffin. Its highly polished surface reflects her face like a mirror. Then the coffin is open and she sees herself lying in it. The lid is nailed down and she lights the pyre with one of the votive candles. Inside the coffin her other self, still alive, knocks and cries out pitifully: "Mamma, Poppa." But she has no mercy.

The scene parallels another sequence in which Jenny tries desperately to reach her parents through a locked door, again and again knocking and crying out "Mamma, Papa." Their departure is as mysterious to her as their mutual reappearance. This confusion brings on a fury of rejection from Jenny and she beats them with her hands, punishing them for abandoning her by their sudden deaths.

Tomas helps Jenny through the worst of her trauma, keeping vigil beside her bed, talking like a close friend, confiding his faults and weaknesses. When Jenny exhausts her pent-up passions and emerges from the isolated depths, she learns that Tomas will be leaving for a long time.

In a reversal of her previous attitude—"I can take care of myself," she asks, "So you mean I'll have to manage on my own?"

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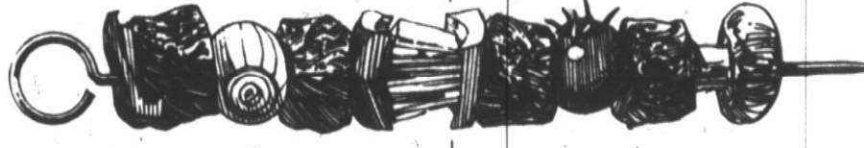
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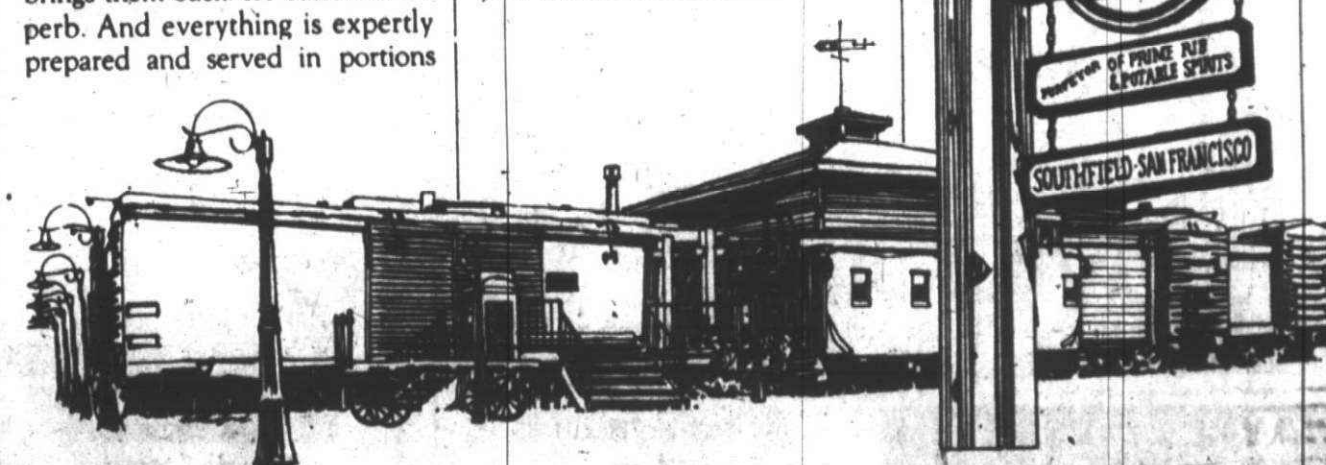

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Tattoo players stage humor

They run around and around in a circle until things get too chaotic and the circle breaks down.
A whistle blows.
They turn around and run in the opposite direction.
A kindergarten class? A football practice? A prison exercise period?
No, it's just the latest production of the Tattoo Players.

Tattoo is not your ordinary theater company. They specialize in original musicals that are take-offs on a familiar children's story, such as their most recent efforts, "Little Red" and "Goldie & the Bears," which they performed Aug. 20-22 at the Lawrence Institute of Technology in Southfield.
BUT THE SHOWS operate on two levels, a mixture of the basic ingredients of children's theater with more sophisticated

humor that goes over the kid's heads. Tattoo manages the difficult task of entertaining children without boring their parents.
Some of the more mature humor takes the form of one-liners, but more often it consists of a new twist on an old story, such as the wolf in Little Red (whose name is Eliot) giving his version of "The Little Boy who Cried Wolf."
"This kid kept crying 'Wolf, wolf, and I kept coming over, to see what wanted," begins Eliot. "I told him that if he called me one more time for no reason I was gonna have him for dinner."
The characters in a Tattoo production also vary somewhat from the original. In "Little Red," Granny is portrayed as an aging femme fatale who makes a pass at the wolf.

TATTOO PRODUCTIONS is a non-profit organization which got started three years ago, and has put on shows for audiences that range from elementary school classes to a group of stroke patients. It is made up mostly of teachers and college students, although it also includes a recreational director and a data processor.

"We just tell them to give up everything for the run of the show," said Laurie Sears, who writes the music for the shows and is the accompanist.

"Every once in a while we'll get a call from a hospital and they say they saw an article in the paper. 'Can you be there a week from Thursday?'"

The shows allow for a lot of audience participation, especially from the kids. Joe Uria, who plays Eliot, begins the "Little Boy who Cried Wolf" monologue by asking some kids in the audience how they heard the story.

"We know we're going to get some pretty bad responses sometimes," said Miss Sears. "Sometimes nothing at all. Then we know we've failed somewhere."

A LOT OF experimentation goes into the final product, said Miss Sears. The group will occasionally rehearse in front of a

group of school children, so that Miss Sears and Robert Leider, who writes the story and lyrics, can see first-hand what works and what doesn't.

Miss Sears said that she and Leider try to get a variety of types of music into each show. Usually Leider writes the lyrics first, but "every once in a while he'll get stymied and say 'I need an Andrews Sisters number to go with this,'" she said.

All of the profits from a Tattoo production go into the next production, but somehow they still have enough money for a nice touch at the end of the show. On their way out of the theater, the children in the audience get door prizes.

"We give them shirts and balls and things," said business coordinator Aaron Leider, the writer's brother. "The kids like it."



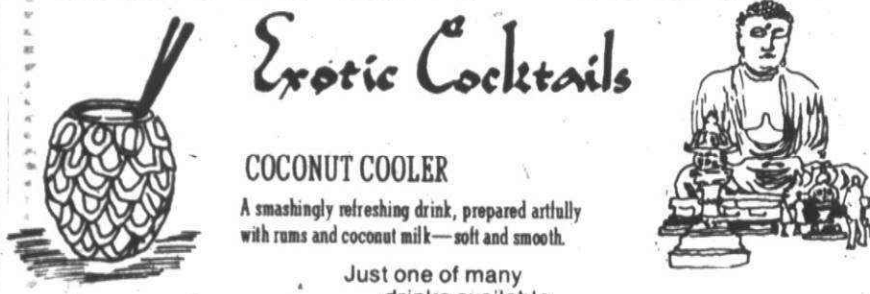

'Selma' star candid about new role

Stepping back on stage after a 2 1/2-year lay-off would be hard enough without portraying a friend of yours.

That's the challenge facing Kim Weston, a native Detroit native who is appearing as Rosa Parks in the Music Hall production of "Selma," a musical about the civil rights movement, running through Sept. 5.

"She's one of my favorite people," said Miss Weston of Mrs. Parks, who reached national prominence in 1955 when she, a

black woman, refused to yield her seat to a white man on a bus in Montgomery, Ala. She has lived in Detroit since 1957.

"I think that helps me," said Miss Weston of knowing Mrs. Parks. "I don't know if I'm giving the director and producer what they want."

The challenge would be playing a character like Mrs. Parks, who has a very mild temper, and giving it the energy necessary for the stage," she said.

MISS WESTON said Tommy Butler, another native Detroit native who wrote the show, wrote a character who is not as quiet as the real Mrs. Parks. "So I'm sort of between the character he wrote and the character I know."

Stepping into a show that had already run for a year in Los Angeles means that Miss Weston had yet another conflicting interpretation of Mrs. Parks.

"The people who played the role before

me didn't play it the way I'm playing it, and I'm sure that is because they didn't know Mrs. Parks," she said.

But stepping into the show, according to Miss Weston, has been less difficult than just coming back to performing after taking 2 1/2 years off to write, produce and "try to improve myself on the technical aspects."

"It's like anything else. It's like a car: If you let it sit, it doesn't get right up and

start like it would if you drove it every day."

Still another difficulty in the role is that Mrs. Parks is 63 years old, while Miss Weston is only 36.

"IT'S JUST A matter of staying in character," she said, although she noted that in one rehearsal she drew a comment from the author when she "bounced out" to make an entrance.

"Mr. Butler told me, 'That was Kim Weston who bounced out, not Rosa Parks.'"

Miss Weston said that the show's current run is getting better every night. "I've been waiting for the show to settle, because they added some choreography and took some things out. I understand."

She is impressed with the attitude of the cast. "The people who are working in the show are dedicated, which is unusual. The people in a cast, usually, they want to be a star, but they don't usually want so much for a single property to work."

Miss Weston is unsure whether she will stay with "Selma" when it leaves Detroit and moves on to Chicago.

"I've been asked to stay, but I have a few projects of my own," she explained.

"Of course," she added with a smile, "if they make me an offer I can't refuse, I'll be glad to go."

Military memories 'mustered' at Village

The third annual Colonial Military Muster at Greenfield Village Saturday and Sunday has a full line-up of activity and excitement. This two-day event recalling Revolutionary War military life on both sides of the battle line will feature close to 3,000 authentically-uniformed soldiers and four costumed musical groups.

The Colonial Military Muster has continued to grow in scope, since its addition to the Village special events calendar in 1974. This year, some 21 military units — both Colonial and Crown Forces — will participate and, for the first time, some of their ac-

tivities will be staged in front of Henry Ford Museum at no charge.

Each day's Muster program begins at 8:45 a.m. with a flag-raising ceremony in front of the Museum. Later, the focal point shifts to the Village where uniformed fife and drum units stage performances of 18th-century military music on the Green.

At noon, all military units and the fife and drum corps assemble in front of the Museum for weapons inspection followed by a parade to the Village Activities Field where the balance of each day's activities takes place.

Following opening ceremonies and

unit inspection on the field, the troops will demonstrate tactical maneuvers and 18th-century drill procedures. Once each day, individual units will present live musket and cannon demonstrations using authentic weapons of the period.

On both Saturday and Sunday afternoons, a showing of 18th-century fashions for women and children takes place on the field, while, in front of the Museum, a fife and drum corps entertains.

As a grand finale to each day's Mus-

ter program, all participating units, both Colonial and Loyalist, assemble on the Activities Field for a mock battle using the military maneuvers their ancestors used during the Revolutionary War.

Throughout the Muster, four costumed musical groups will provide the stirring sounds of long ago. The First Michigan Colonial Fife and Drum Corps from Macomb County, Michigan returns to the Village Muster this year to perform the martial music of the 1700s.

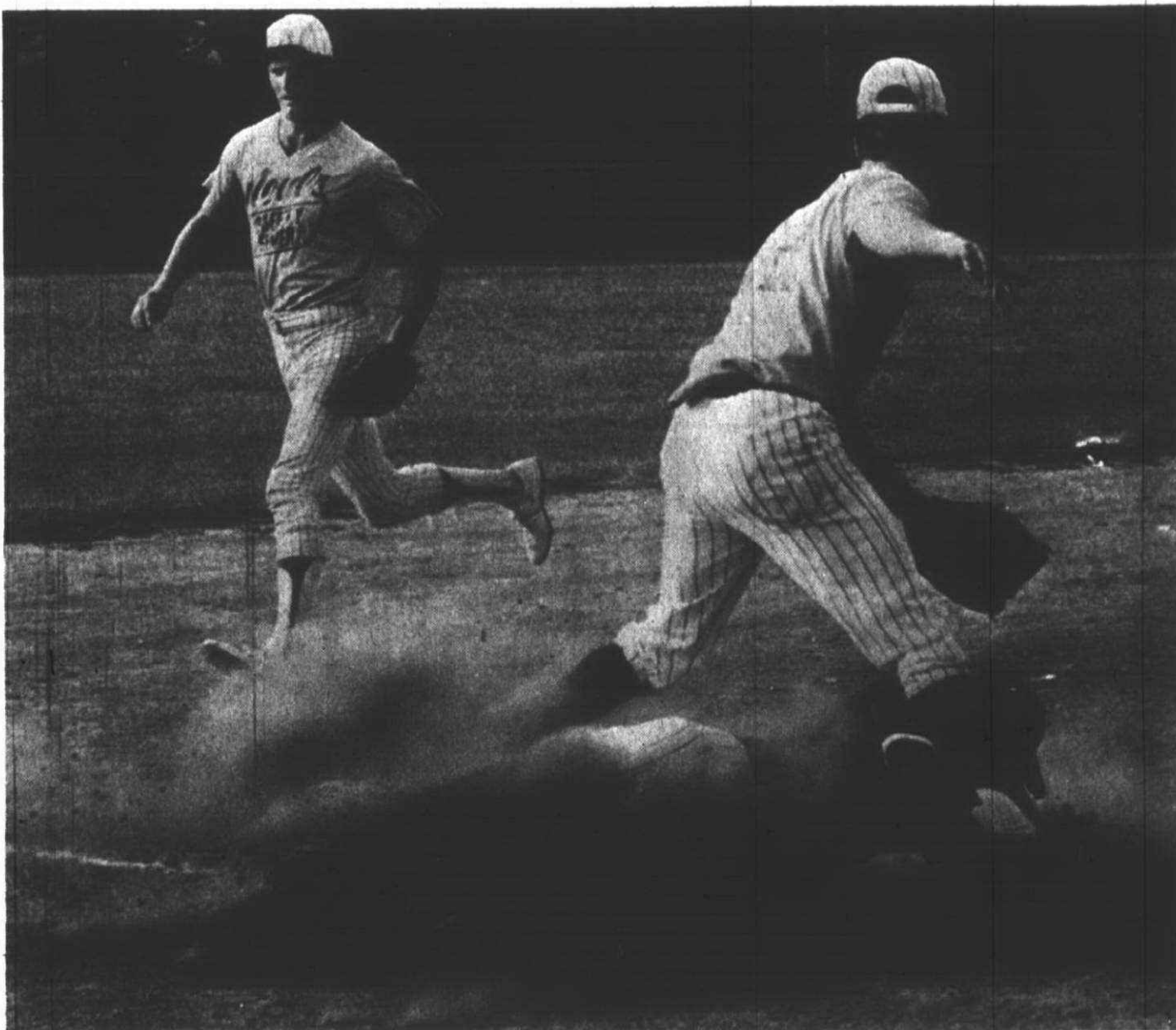
Crowe had loaded the bases prior to the homer on walks to Dan Dinsmore and Brian Butcher and a hit batsman, Mike Robbins.

There's a strange thing happening on the University of Michigan campus as the football team begins practice for the fall season—people are talking about the Rose Bowl.

In other years, all talk of the Roses was taboo until Woody Hayes and the Buckeyes of Ohio State came into sight. Then the battle was on and the trip to the bowl be-

came the main topic—even in the most sacred precincts.

Now all of that has changed. While there may be many a slip between now and November, there is the feeling all around that this year's team that opens the season against Wisconsin on Sept. 11 is Rose Bowl-bound.

The leader of the optimistic group is husky Kirk Lewis, the former Garden City West star, who missed last season because

of injuries. He was to have his career in the stadium last year. But injuries in the practice sessions caused him to miss the entire campaign.

Now with that year of eligibility left, he decided to take a leave from medical school and rejoin the squad for what he called, "a chance to play in the Rose Bowl."
