14 regular officers start work Nov. 19

Fourteen people attending the Criminal Justice Institute for police certification will be sworn in as Canton Township's new "regularly-employed part-time police officers" on Nov. 19 during the CJI graduation ceremony

as regular part-time employees was passed by a one vote margin Tuesday night. Supervisor-Police Chief Robert graduates-was the person who east the de-

The decision to designate the 14 people ciding vote in a 4-3 decision. Greenstein-who will be among the 14

Greenstein says "regularly-employed" part-time employes are not eligible for pension. However, federal law states that any employee who works more than 1.000 hours a year must be covered by the em-

ployer's pension plan Greenstein says that unlike police reserves, the certified regular (part-time) employees will be required to report for work on certain days at certain hours.

John Flodin, Robert Greenstein, Jerry Cheske and Carl Parsell all voted to designate Canton's CJI graduates as regularly employed part-time officers. Trustees James Poole Brian Schwall and Robert Myers voted against the motion.

Schwall said he couldn't accept 14 people as Canton's first certified patrol officers without having those people screened in a psychological test.

"Can the Criminal Justice Institute weed people out who're psychologically unfit for police duty?" Schwall asked. Greenstein responded by saying that any-

one who makes it through the seven-week course "without blowing his top is psychologically fit, believe me.

At that point Greenstein tore into Schwall for "bringing up a red herring"

'There's no psychological testing for policemen in existence today." Greenstein claimed. His slate-mate Carl Parsell. executive director of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM) concurred with "I'll say this slowly so you understand

ber when we had an expert psychologist from the Plymouth Community School District come before this board and she told you that there is no test presently in existence that can tell you if a policeman is psy chologically unfit. This you so blithely choose to ignore but I repeat-there is no adequate psychological testing procedures for policemen period.

Parsell told the board and audience that he is aware of research going on by a team of professors and doctors that is attempting to measure a policeman's ability to cope with stress. But that group's research is incomplete.

"Psychological tests ask people if they like girls and then they hit somebody on the knee with a rubber hammer." Parsell said. "All that shows is that they like girls and they got hit in the knee with a rubber

Schwall cut in saving that if that was the extent of Parsell's knowledge of psycholigical testing then he was not surprised

Parsell was opposed to it. Greenstein shook his head and limped out of the meeting about half hour early due to the fact that he had to be up at 4 a.m. to attend police academy. The limp was caused from the rigorous schedule at

CJI, according to Greenstein.

"I can't understand those three people Greenstein said on his way out the door. They all voted to send these people to police school and then they turn around and won't accept them once they finish their schooling. The same thing happened when we sent the people to reserve school."

Homeowners hate apts.

About 25 residents of Windsor Park and its homeowner group turned out for the Canton board Monday night in an attempt to block Slavik Builders from building 149 new multiple units at the northwest corner; of Morton Taylor and Warren roads.

The confrontation appeared to be a stalemate at the beginning of the hour-and a half-discussion. Gerald T. Odum, an official in the Slavik Co., told the board and the subdivision people that his company had already redesigned apartments and moved back property in an effort to go beyond the minimum property line setbacks. He said the 149 proposed units represented "the bottom fine" needed to make sure the builders made a minimal profit on their investment.

WILLIAM BOTWICK, spokesman for the homeowners, said their group would not budge from its stand calling for the construction of only single-family homes with ownership, not rentals."

Supervisor Robert Greenstein, who has made opposition to multiples his battle cry, advised the crowd of homeowners to meet with the builder's representative for two weeks between the next board meeting

to try to work out a compromise. Recognizing that denying Slavik the right to build apartments on an area already zoned for Planned Unit Development (PUD) multiples could be taken to court, Greenstein said the Windsor Park people should make every attempt to meet with the builder and attempt to reach an

'It's not good to go into court on any issue when the judge asks you if you've tried and failed at every effort to resolve the matter through discussion by both parties and it was you who cut off communication." Greenstein told the homeowners. 'As a lawyer, not supervisor, reconsider your position for two weeks and then even if nothing changes you can say that you tried. Then nobody can charge you with cutting off negotiations."

After this legal advice, 'the homeowners unanimously voted to meet with is these buildings. We want to create a pleas-Slavik during the next two weeks. After an hour-and-a-half of board and audience discussion, the matter was tabled until the

Nov. 9 board meeting. Eour sunits already exist on the Slavik site. They were originally intended to be sold as condominiums but the market on condominiums dropped in 1974 Just about the time they opened. Slavik Builders went" to the township board to see if it could change the PUD agreement to allow them to build apartments instead of con-

dominiums and the previous board agreed. The original PUD, passed back in 1969 (for a different landowner who later sold the land to Slavik), called for 98 apartments and 55 townhouse condominiums.

Greenstein claims that it is possible for the present board to deny Slavik the right to build 153 multiple family apartment. units because he says the prior board never set the PUD amendment to allow apartments in writing. The action by that board could be inter-

preted as an amendment but I see nothing written," Greenstein said. "Now they may have the right to go out and build 90 condominiums rather than 153 multiple family units. Admittedly they could build a case on the fact that they had a shovel in the ground and that they had a building per-

'But I'm irrevocably convinced as supervisor and a lawyer that Slavik has problems legally. I hope we can settle with them amicably buth if necessary we-and I'm only one vote on the board-could revoke the 1974 site plan if we reach an absolute roadblock.

The builder's representative, Odom, said he believes his company has "shown we're a good neighbor" by redesigning the buildings, moving them back, and meeting with the people of Windsor Park: The neighbors did have significant

Complete details on the election will be published in Thursday's edition of the Ob-PLYMOUTH'S COMMUNITY radio sta-

tion, WSDP-FM (89.3 on the dial) announced last week that it plans to carry live local, election results throughout the evening Nov. 2.

Under the direction of news directors Mike Schulte and Tim Halevan, student news staff members will be posted at local tabulation centers to immediately relay local race results to listeners.

Student reporters will be at Plymouth City Hall, Plymouth Township Hall, and Canton Township Hall to bring live telephone reports to listerners. Throughout the evening the news staff also will follow state and national race and issues.





Canton students give Ford mock landslide

High school students may not always agree with their parents but more often than not their voting preferences are

pretty close to their parents' views. Government classes at Plymouth Canton High School conducted a mock election on Tuesday and Wednesday and gave President Gerald Ford approximately 65 per cent of the vote to Carter's 35 per cent.

Out of 717 students voting. Ford received 403 votes. Carter got 225. Eugene McCartey picked up 27 votes.

For senate, Canton High School students picked Marvin Esch over Don Riegle by a mere 34 votes. Esch got 331 votes to Riegle's 297

That shows me that some of the Ford

voters crossed over and voted for Riegle.' explained Audrey Ettiene, the government teacher at the high school supervised the

More students voted for the proposals than president, possible indicating that they were more excited by those issues than the presidential choice.

Proposal A. which asks people to determine whether no-deposit-no-return bottles should be banned, was passed by more than a 2 to 1 margin. Some 451 students voted yes and 210 students voted against the bottle bill.

THE RESULTS ON Proposal B were most interesting

Proposal B, if passed, would reduce the age requirement to run for state senate and state representative to age 18. It would require persons who run for state senate and state representative to live in and be a registered elector of that district Student voters, many of them almost 18 themselves, barely passed Proposal B. The yes side squeaking by with only a 16 vote

Both tax proposals were voted down by the students

On Proposal C the no side received 339 votes to 285 in the yes column. If passed, Proposal C would limit all state taxes and spending to 8.3 percent of the combined state personal income

Proposal D would replace the present flat rate state income tax with a graduated income tax. It was voted down 367 to

In the 15th district U.S. Congress race incumbent William Ford got 315 votes compared to Republican James Walasky's 235. In the 37th House District Thomas Brown beat Brian Kidston in Canton

Ninth through twelfth grade students at the school participated in the voting. The government students check voters names against the school roster to prevent people from voting twice. At the end of the second day the machine's tally matched that of the poll workers.

Many students will be turning 18 after the Dec. 1, the determining date for stu-

Plymouth Township and Canton will be registering seniors in the spring.

The clerk of Canton Township, John Flodin, lent the voting machines to Canton High. When the mock election was over he cleared the machines of all the votes and removed three write-in votes that had been written on the paper roll

Although Canton voting machines were used. Mrs. Ettiene did not tabulate the results of the Canton Township election. She explained that the results would not be representative because 65 percent of the students who used the machines do not live in Canton Township.

Twp. employees' jobs secure says attorney

Since Canton Township's civil service Ordinance No. 40 has been officially declared 'not effective." many township employes are wondering whether their job was jeopardized or if they could be fired at will.

George Ward, attorney for Canton Township, stated in his opinion that employes hired with the understanding that they were protected by the now-defunct Ordinance 40. have the prowhether Ordinance 40 is effec-

When Canton Township was taken to court on the police reserve controversy. Wayne Circuit Judge Joseph Sullivan stated that he did not think Canton voters ever really voted to set up a civil service ordinance to cover its employes. Upon further research, it became evident that voters had merely passed an advisory question affirming a "merit system" approach to hiring

Ward states that "a voter may have favored the merit principle without understanding or tending to state that he approved specifically of the then pending proposal which later purportedly became Ordi-

Ward believes that the civil service setup was never made official because the ballot did not specifically mention Ordinance 40 and its powers

The wording of the May 1972 ballot question, aside from inaccurately referring to Section 7, rather than Section 6 of Article XI (of the Michigan Constitution) does not refer to any specific civil service measure but merely asks an advisory vote on 'a merit system'," Ward writes.

When the news that civil service was kaput came, the present administration dashed out a letter to all employes promising to extend all protection that would have been guaranteed under a valid civil service ordinance.

Peter Bundarin, Republican candidate for supervisor commented last week that employes were already protected because they were hired with the understanding that civil service was effective. Any breach of the contract, argued Bundarin. could not penalize the township employee. Ward's opinion seems to substantiate Bundarin's interpretation.


water is needed to maintain it. Treasurer Carl Pursell objected to the request saying. "We have an ordinance





High-rise issue blasted

Four Republican members on the Ypsilanti Čity Council are opposing the second senior citizens highrise proposal, saving there is no 'demonstrated need' and the Nov. 2 ballot diestion is "deceptive."

In a statement released over the weekend, the GOP councilmembers based their opposition on three points: the lack of a "demonstratedneed." the high cost to the city and loss of downtown parking space.

The statement was signed by Mayor Pro Tem John D. (Dale) Hooker, 2nd Ward; Mrs. Nathalie E. Edmunds, 2nd Ward; Martin H. Gillentine, 5th Ward; and James J.

Keegan Jr., 5th Ward. City voters will decide next week whether or not the council should be authorized to sell the Goodwill Municipal Parking Lot on Pearl Street to the Forest City Dillon, Inc., of Cleveland to build a 180-unit highrise apartment building for senior citizens. The first such facility, Towne Centre Place on W. Michigan Avenue, was opened last

Mrs. Edmunds said today Proposal I on the city ballot is "deceptive" and "dishonest" because it does not specify that the development will be for low income and subsidized tenants.

"The developer said it could be 100 per cent subsidized with people paying \$50 to \$60 a month," she said. owne Centre has 25 per cent its

tenants receiving a rent subsidy. The GOP members also referred to a waiting list for occupancy at the Towne Centre Place showing 300 names on it as "most revealing." They said nearly 40 on the list were from the Detroit area, 25 from Ann Arbor and 32 from Ypsilanti Township with many others living in lymouth, Willis, Milan, South Monroe, Wayne, Manchester. Saline and even Cleveland.

Acting City Manager Herbert Smith today refused to release the waiting list 'on the advice of the city attorney.' City Atty. Ronald Egnor was not available for comment.

A copy of the waiting list obtained by The Ypsilanti Press confirmed that many of the applicants for Towne Centre occupancy had telephone numbers for areas out side Ypsilanti. There were no addresses on the list. About one-third of the applicants are those sceking rent supplement.

"The City of Ypsilanti has already provided an adequate number of public and subsidized housing units for ITS OWN citizens," reads the Republicans" statement. "Ypsilanti has one unit of public housing for every 133.9 citizens, and that doesn't include our present senior citizen highrise. Ann Arbor has one unit of public housing for every 3,144.7 citizens and they turned this project

(highrise for the elderly) down. Ypsilanti was moved up on the priority list for financing after Ann Abor withdrew its application for senior citizens highrise development.

Mrs. Edmunds said the information was furnished by the Michigan Municipal League. "We cannot continue to assume the burden of providing public and subsidized housing for residents of surrounding communities," she

The highrise foes also contend that the project would result in a fax revenue loss because the Goodwill parking lot and its adjoining lots will be tax exempt and an alternative parking lot, possibly that at the Huron Hotel, to be purchased for public parking also will be taken off the tax roll.

The city bought the Goodwill property for \$193,000 several years ago, and the same price is likely to be offered by the developers. The Huron Hotel parking lot, which the city might consider buying to recoup the lost downtown parking space, is estimated at \$400,000.

The Greater Ypsilanti Area Chamber of Commerce also is opposed to the Goodwill property conversion plan, citing loss of downtown parking and loss of tax money in the series of transactions.

Mayor George D. Goodman, a Democrat and suporter of the project, was not available for response to the Republicans'

allegations Councilman Eric Jackson, a Human Rights Party member from the 4th Ward, said today the highrise foes must "go door-to-door to see that a lot of people are living in disgusting

He said if senior citizens from other places want to come to Ypsilanti, "to me that's great and I'll be glad that this town has senior citizens who would want to come."

Earlier, Bernard Harr, regional development manager for Forest Dillon, appeared before the council to make a presentation on the company's second senior citizens housing plan in the city. He said the firm has developed 80 such facilities throughout the country. He could not be reached today for comment on the waiting list and how it was

City proposal blasted

Twelve already live in public or subsidized housing. Many names appeared several times on the list. In a telephone sampling, some names were not known at the telephone numbers listed.

The city of Ypsilanti has already provided an adequate number of public and subsidized housing units for its own citizens! Ypsilanti has one unit of public housing for every 133.9 citizens, and that doesn't include our present senior citizen high rise. Ann Arbor has one unit of ublic housing for every 3,144.7 itizens and they turned this project down! Lincoln Park has one unit to 30.7 citizens, Romulus one unit to 228.7 and Livonia one unit to 679.6. We can not continue to assume the borden of providing public and

subsidized housing for residents of surrounding communities.

Remember, when public and subsidized housing doesn't pay its share of taxes, the home owner has to pay more! This past year 224 units of public housing made a payment in lieu of taxes and the city's share was only \$4,240. The present senior citizen high rise will pay the city only about \$5,000 this year. Last year Parkview's new tax abatement program cost \$36,000 in total lost taxes. The new high rise would, under law, receive tax abatement and probably city paid utility sub-

We can not afford this again! On Nov. 2, we urge you to vote "NO" on City Ballot Proposal No. 1, the sale of the Goodwill lot to build a senior citizen high rise.







The Student Senate is about to give Schoolcraft College students the first legal a aid service for a community college in Michigan.

The senate is soliciting volunteers from law firms in the district to give students free legal advice for a few hours a week.

"It doesn't offer any financial gain for the lawyer," said Jeff Stabenau, senate president and chief proponent of the plan. "The attorney wouldn't represent them in court. He would give advice on consumer items, landlord-tenant problems, home mortgages—not for severe cases."

"I GOT THE IDEA last winter semester on a visit to Western Michigan University. WMU's service paid \$32 an hour from the student service fee.

"The first couple of years, it was a little slow because there wasn't much publicity. Now the service at WMU is offered six hours a week. They take about 10 cases an hour, so it goes pretty fast." Stabenau

At Schoolcraft, Stabenau took "an unscientific survey of 100 students. Approximately 25 per cent said they would use the service, based on problems they had had in the past year."

Target date for starting the service here is near the end of the current semester.

SCHOOLCRAFT PRESIDENT C. Nelson Grote and Edward V. McNally, vice president for student affairs, visited both WMU and Michigan State University and report-

The administrators were highly supportive of their programs and expected them to continue for some time to come.

If volunteer lawyers can be obtained for Schoolcraft's program, the minor costs of clerical service and supplies can be absorbed by the Student Senate budget, according to the administration and Stabenau.

The college legal firm, Miller, Canfield, Paddock & Stone, offered three bits of advice: Get the support of the legal profession; publish a disclaimer on campus saying "the college assumes no responsibility for the lawyer's actions" and get assurance the law firm has malpractice insurance.



SC hikes fees but cuts budget

At the same time they were raising some student fees, Schoolcraft College trustees had to make a 3.5 per cent cut in

the current \$9.5 million budget. Both changes were made Wednesday by unanimous voice vote of the eight trustees.

The fee increases were made so that students who benefit from some college services would bear a more equitable share of the costs. In revenue terms, the higher fees will produce less than \$4,700 for the 1976-77 fiscal year.

BEGINNING WITH the winter semester. these fees will be clanged

General Education Development tests for non-district residen s-from \$5 to \$10. Commencement feet from \$5 to \$10.

Child care center registration fee-from \$5 down to \$2.50 for the spring and summer sessions, which are shorter than normal semesters.

Physical education uniforms-gym and swimming, from \$7.50 to \$9; gym, from \$6 to \$7.50; swimming, from \$6 to \$7.50; partial. from \$2.50 to \$3.50.

BECAUSE ENROLLMENTS and credit hours taken both declined this fall compared to a year ago, revenues from state aid and tuition dropped a total of \$343,000, or about 3.5 per cent of the nearly \$9.9 million budget the board approved last June

The revised budget totals almost an even \$9.5 million.

President C. Nelson Grote said general student fees (mostly tuition) would drop to a little more than \$2.4 million, or about 6.9 per cent from earlier budget estimates, and state aid would drop to \$3.9 million. about 5.4 per cent below earlier estimates.

Chief reason was the decline in credit hours taken by students. This fall, the twoyear college enrolled 10,059, a drop of only 1.3 per cent from the year before.

But more significantly, those students took only 68,233 credit hours, a decline of 10,634 hours or 13.5 per cent from the year

College board opposes 'C'

The Schoolcraft College board is urging voters to defeat Proposal C on the Nov. 2 ballot. The proposition would set a constitutional limit of 8.3 per cent of personal income on state taxing and spending.

The vote was 6-1. Trustee Arch Vallier was opposed, and Leroy Bennett abstained

The board resolution said Proposal C "has the real potential of substantially affecting state appropriations to community colleges which would necessitate a major increase in tuition and fees as well as the need to seek additional millage just to maintain current programs and services. thereby transferring an additional cost burden to the local community.

The board also directed the administration to lop \$343,000 from expenditures.

IN OTHER financial actions, the board: • Transferred \$201,000 from the contingency account into the payroll accounts to cover pay increases negotiated with the Faculty Forum, bargaining agent for in-

· Awarded Tektronix, Inc. of Farmington Hills a contract of \$7.391 for eight new and one reconditioned oscilloscopes for the electronics lab. Tektronix was lowest of three

· Awarded Observer & Eccentric Newspapers a contract for \$4,910 to print 97.000 winter class schedules.

 Accepted a \$50 donation to the special equipment fund from Tea and Crumpets, a charitable tennis tournament which used college facilities last summer in an effort to aid Children's Hospital.

· Accepted a \$100 gift for a scholarship fund from the Associate Degree Nursing Alumni Association of Schoolcraft College.

· Accepted \$120 for the Beatrice McDonald Memorial Scholarship Fund from the 2d District-Wayne Democratic Committee.

'Postage stamp' yard acclaimed

This week the Plymouth Branch Woman's National Farm and Garden Association's "Citation of Beauty" award goes to a postage stamp yard.

This yard, so dubbed by its owners, Mr. and Mrs. H. Oliver Foster, is on the corner of Ann Arbor Trail and Evergreen. As a result of their labors, it offers an inviting and interesting vista to both the car traveler and the pedestrian.

The Fosters came to Plymouth from the Williamsburg area where their property encompassed several acres. To confine their gardening activities to their new, small yard became a challenge well met.

AT THE FRONT of their white house, a brick fireplace is flanked by two windows.

There is no entrance on this side. This enabled them to have an uninterrupted flower and shrub bed planted in such a way that it cuts the height of the house. By carrying the double railroad-tie bed beyond the corner for about seven feet, they were able to plant more shrubs and even during the summer have their vegetables there -unobserved by the

Two peach trees in this area also add to the gastronomic pleasures. There is a Sargent's crab tree, dwarfed by pruning several pfitzers, an emerald green maple, and an unidentified but interestingly texturedevergreen which will begin its espaliered growth up their chimney next summer.

passersby

Two purple plum trees (ornamental) bring a deep tone to the other soft green

THE FOSTERS have not forgotten the

birds. A pair of mountain ash trees aglow with their orange berries attract flocks of goldfinches asthey wend their way south. It is in this bed that the soft blue creeping phlox, azaleas and tulips begin the

spring color parade. Starting the transition from front yard to side vard, they have planted quite close together-possibly within two yards of each other- a scarlet oak and a sweet gum tree. Both were selected for their radiant fall color and interesting leaf shapes Botany students treasure these leaves in their

collections. It is the Fosters' side yard which really won them their award. It is their big outdoor welcome mat

EVER BEING CHANGED, it is the kind of place that makes people say. "We wonder what exciting thing they will do next. How do you make 22 feet look like 30? One way is to do as the Fostershave done (This was their "interesting thing" for this

They created a new and bigger vista by incorporating the sidewalk into a circle which extends from their redwood-planked stoop to the graveled edge of their car

parking area. The major portion of the circle is made from small round brown-toned pebbles covered with Prairie Film, a plastic which seeps in and is porous so that the rain can seep through. It makes a most durable and attractive surface-one that is very smooth and comfortablefor walking.

Surrounding the pebbled center, three rows of pink brick laid side-by-side and end-to-end bring color and trim to the

SET IN HOLES in this area are three ce-

ramic urns and one redwood tub filled

with a succession of flowers during the sea-Our house is very symetrical- and we

wanted to bring in a formal flavor to our plans." Jan Foster said. Repeating the roundness of the entrance, she used three round placemats as the

background for a door hanging which changes with the seasons.

Beginning in the spring there are baskets of trailing vines and fresh flowers and continuing through the fall when she uses mums and Royal Polonius nut pods, the later a product of Virginia.

Her door also is redwood—a one-piece redwood shutter adorned by, inaddition to the mats, an antique brass knocker bell and flanked by a pair of long redwood shutters. A stone bench provides a place to chat and admire

Though the dorabells no longer produce their airy spikes pansies-yellow and blue to match their daughter's wedding-are

At the base of a near-perfect Douglas fir staggered platts of brick"stepping stones" direct a visitor to the back yard which is surrounded by a weathered stockade fence. Blue clematis softens the lines and gives a colorful trailing pattern on its

FOLLOWING THE SPRING bulbs, geraniums, wax begonias, marigolds, verbenas and lantanas provide color spots between

Redwood chips help the soil retain the moisture and dispel the weeds. Altogether, the Foster yard can serve as a special inspiration for anyone who lives on a corner and has only a small area to

One-dish meal for election day

The tantalizing scent of steaming paella may well be wafting over the entire metropolitan area as folks gather to watch election returns tomorrow night, and the reason is Julia Child and her faithful follow-

The lady who has moved her kitchen into thousands of living rooms via television showed up in Redford Township to demonstrate preparation of Election Day Paella, a luscious one-dish meal with chicken, rice, sausage, shrimp and vegetables, and her fans returned the favor by coming to her borrowed kitchen.

Her presence was like a magnet to pull a crowd of 300, give or take a devotee or two, into the showroom of Kitchen Glamor

The legions of cooks-mostly women, but a few men were on hand, too- had traveled from all over to enjoy with the exhuberent Julia the satisfy whack of sharp knife on chicken, the beauty of fresh green beans cooked to perfection and the pervading aroma of just right seasonings.

"I just wish I could have had, a taste," signed Altha Delany, who drove over from Romulus. "That's how my mother taught

Sandy Kavanagh and Mary Schafer arrived from Sterling Heights to camp by the store on Grand River at 6:20 a.m. It was worth the wait of better than three hours, they decided. While many had to stand in cramped quarters to watch Julia cook, they had choice seats.

USING AN electric wok in the mirrored kitchen, the master of French cooking first browned onions and sausage and then cut up a chicken-"Give it a good whack," she admonished-and browned it, making a point of dropping scraps into a boiling pot for broth.

When the chicken was nicely browned, Julia added water with vermuth, then rice and seasonings and the green beans cooked in the French manner.

Finally, she poked in some large, raw shrimp, in the shell with the tails sticking out, added choppped tomatoes-she said

to-mah-toes-and ripe olives, and garnished the whole thing with lemon wedges and parsley

The result, she suggested, could make listening to the elections returns an enjoyable time, never mind whose candidate

JULIA CHILD was making her first visit to the Detroit area in 15 years. The purpose was to publicize her new book on French cooking "From Julia Child's Kitch-She had come to the area in 1961 when

her first cookbook came off the presses. but that was before half the cooks in America had watched the robust, down-to-earth woman on television and come to think of her as friend and neighbor.

"I've watched her for years" were the words heard again and again as the squeezed-in audience compared notes. 'Had the day off from the post office,'

explained Bill Lowe of Taylor as he stood in line with a new book to be autographed. "I saw her so often, I just had to get over and buy a book.'

Toula Patsalis, Kitchen Glamor vicepresident, said she was delighted that the equipment in the Redford store had made it the chosen spot for the appearance, and would have liked more space to accomodate the crowd.

"But she's marvelous, isn't she?" Mrs. Patsalis enthused.

THE PAELLA didn't need full attention all the time, so the visiting cook had some time to answer questions and expound a bit on her theories of cooking.

She explained the cooking of beans in the French manner. "The beans, or whatever green vegetable you use, must be fresh," she insist-

Severe winter may starve deer

Wildlife biologists from universities in Michigan and the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) are warning that trouble is ahead for the state's deer herd unless it is held to a reasonable size. Because previous warnings have largely

been ignored. Michigan is beginning to feel the effects of an excessively large herd Deer normally feed on crops, but if their numbers are large, the damage they do is beyond what farmers can reasonably be expected to tolerate." said Glenn Dudderar. Michigan State University cooperative

Under unfavorable weather conditions. such as this summer's drought, the prob-Iem is intensified to the point farmers suffer unusually heavy losses.

extension wildlife specialist.

Damage to crops has occurred statewide, but in some areas such as Kalkaska and Menoninee counties, deer have destroved the major portion of some farmers' crops." said Dudderar "Deer also are destroying their, own habitat by overbrowsing the plants they feed upon, and, in the process are destroying the seedlings that would be tommorrow's forest," he

Deer-car collisions also are increasing and are expected to be much higher in number than last year's 14,000 accidents

WILDLIFE BIOLOGISTS estimate that Michigan could support about a million deer before hunting season without unacceptable loss to crops, forest, motorists and the deer habitat itself. There are more than a million deer in Michigan with no population reduction expected

Present regulations under which the DNR must function are simply not adequate to handle the herd situation which now exists. The reason for this inadequacy is due to conflicting political pressure. which has limited the department." Dudde-

Under the present law, it is often impossible to adjust herd size where it needs to starvation, disease and accidents.

be adjusted. It is not a matter of how many deer exist per square mile but how much food that square mile has to support the deer adequately.

"The problem is most severe in the nothern two-thirds of the state, because of the additional threat of a severe winter drastically reducing food supplies for deer." he said. "In winter, deer habitat may support only one-tenth the number of deer it supported during summer months.

"As with any animal, a poorly feed deer cannot physically nor physiologically function as well as a well-fed deer." Dudderar

Putting these factors together-barren young deer, unthrifty adult deer, and overbrowsed habitat-and add a severe winter. This equation predicts trouble for deer.

The drought this summer has already shown how unfavorable weather can suddenly create serious trouble for both people and deer when deer numbers are excessive." he added.

Allowing nature to take this course, reducing the herd by starvation and disease to a level the habitat can adequately support is not the best answer because both people and deer suffer needlessly. This type of reduction is not quick and merciful for the deer. Also fewer deer can be seen. photographed or hunted.

Considering the fact that we have the necessary management tools to prevent such needless loss and waste and yet maintain a socially désirable deer population. I think letting nature take its course is a poor alternative." Dudderar said.

"Supplementing the diet of the herd with farm produce during harsh winters might work in a few areas of the state where deer are used to a hay and corn diet but it is expensive and impractical." he said.





Reform advocated

Target: Nursing home abuse. Democratic Senator John Otterbacher of Grand Rapids wants to reform Michigan's nursing home system.. and he's introduced legislation toward that goal. Terming his proposal "tough-minded." Otterbacher explains that it's aimed at bolstering the state's legal base for regulating nursing

'The current system offers no incentive for nursing home operators to improve their facilities." he says. "Consequently. Michigan taxpayers are paying out \$300 million a year for a system that guarnatees neither high quality of care nor reasonable protections against fraud.

Requiring homes with 50 or more beds to have a full-time administrator and closing a legal loophole which currently allows homes with fewer than seven beds to operate without a valid license are just two provisions of Otterbacher's proposed law

In addition, it would · Upgrade professional staff requirements, calling for a registered nurse as director of nursing and at least one licensed nurse on duty, at all times.

•Require 2.25 hours of nursing care per patient per day; a licensed mental health professional to serve patient needs; and all nursing homes to have a plan for immediate access to hospitals in emergencies.

· Prohibit financial kickbacks for such transactions as physician's referral of patients to nursing homes and a home's purchase of pharmaceuticals.

·Require a complete investigation process that allows for anonymous complaints by nursing home patients or their represen-

To find out if their field beans have such blight. Michigan farmers can contact the state Department of Agriculture through Dec. 15 and have five pound samples tested for \$5 each.

If germination tests are also requested, the charge is an additional \$2.50 per

The fee is a special seasonal one. It goes up to \$15 each sample between Dec. 16 and March 15, and tests are not available from March 16 through Oct. 1 of next year.

Forms to accompany samples can be obtained from the Michigan Department of Agriculture, Laboratory Division, 1615 S. Harrison, East Lansing, 48823.

Advanced degrees pay off, survey finds

Education still pays, judging by the annual survey of Wayne State University graduates by the WSU Placement Services

The survey seeks to determine what happens to college graduates when they enter

the world of work In the most recent survey, nearly 3,000 of the 6,479 graduates of WSU's December 1974 and June 1975 classes responded. Most revealed salary information in the con-

fidential questionnaire Two obvious points emerged. Salaries in all degree classifications advanced from the previous year. And those with more than one degree were clearly better off financially than less educated persons.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE recipients reported an average annual salary of \$11.499. for example, while persons who received master's degrees earned an average \$15,286. Educational specialist degree holders were paid \$18.956; Ph D. degree recipients. \$17.067: and law degree holders.

Average salaries reported the year before were about \$1,000 less, except for those holding law degrees, who only

earned \$1 more in 1974-75. While graduates earning the Ed.D. degree reported an average salary of \$21.414. in most cases that figure reflects years of employment with the same school system. Conversely, the \$11,956 salary paid to medical doctos reflects income of docts in their first year of residency.

(\$14,174) and business administration (\$13.158) graduates led the bachelor's de greee recipients in salary, while education (\$10,006), liberal arts (\$10,756) and Montieth College (\$9,277) graduates were among the lowest paid

The job picture wasn't all sweetness and light with grads of a year ago, however,. They reported an overall unemployment rate of 7.5 per cent, only slightly below the national average of eight per cent at that

And 17 per cent reported they were work ing in jobs unrelated to their career fields. In many cases that would have occurred by choice, as in the instance of a full-time employe earning a degree in a different field as a part-time student (56 per cent of the WSU students said they worked for their employer before graduation). But in other cases it clearly was a matter of taking an available job, even if it were unrelated to one's chosen field.





Rocks nearly pull off upset

Those unpredictable Plymouth Salem Rocks almost pulled off the upset of the season when the gridders lost to a shocked Dearborn Pioneer football team, 33-28, before a jammed homecoming crowd at the Centennial Park field Friday night.

The Rocks weren't supposed to be in this one. They were supposed to be horsewhipped by the bigger Pioneer team. This was the Dearborn crew that bested Edsel Ford one week earlier-the same Edsel Ford that crushed Salem 42-0.

But at the outset of this Suburban Eight League battle, it was the Rocks who proved to be the tougher team. Only a 19point fourth quarter brought the Pioneers out of shock to prevent the upset.

Yes, it was Dearborn who had to battle back, after spotting the Rocks 21 points in the first quarter-and-a-half.

Sizewise, the Pioneers outmanned Salem, and proved it for a three-minute spot in the fourth quarter. That was the time it took Dearborn to capitalize on two Salem fumbles and an interception to score three touchdowns.

But for the rest of the contest, it was the Rocks who dominated the game and actually looked like they were outmanning the Pioneers

The Salem domination is easily reflected in the statistics.

The Rocks had the ball for 62 plays, seven more than Dearborn. The Rocks outrushed their opponent 330-178 yards, close

to doubling the Dearborn total. Total offense saw Salem mount 371 yards to the Pioneers' 258. The Rocks had

18 first downs to Dearborn's 11. 'We didn't deserve to lose this one. said a disappointed Rock coach Tom Moshimer. "The kids played to their full poten-

Moshimer had high praise for his team's performance, calling those 21 first-half points the result of "the best half of football " a Plymouth team has played in his 10 years of coaching at the school.

There was a lesson in life tonight. They (the Rock players) proved they were men and we will come back." IN THAT FIRST HALF, the Rocks came out and showed the Pioneers who was boss

John Broaderick set the tone of this half when he recovered a Dearborn fumble on the third play of the game.

Then the Rock offensive machine went to work-with none other than the wishbone option offense.

Moshimer was skeptical about his triple threat offense before the game, and had a game plan set for throwing the ball more

But the Rocks executed the offense to perfection, scoring the first three time they had the ball

The interior blew the Pioneers right off the line, and all four running backs, quarterback Rich Hewlett, Doug Rowe, Steve Maisner and co-captain Jim Lilley, combined for outstanding rushing efforts.

Rowe and Lilley served as the inside threats while Hewlett and Maisner teamed on the outside.

The execution of the option was so perfect, that the Pioneers didn't know what was coming from play to play.

Hewlett scored the first of three touchdowns after the initial Dearborn fumble, capping the 50-yard drive with a quarterback sneak from one yard out.

Bob Waite was sucessful on the first of three extra point kicks to make the score 7-0 after three minutes of action.

SALEM'S NEXT POSSESSION was more of the same, this time a 79-yard drive in only seven plays, topped by Lilley's nine-yard burst

The Rocks' third drive ran into the first two minutes of the second period, as they traveled 56 yards in eight plays.


Hewlett snuck the ball over the goal line for the 21-0 margin. Dearborn came back on the next possession to score on a long drive midway in the quarter. The Pioneers' leading rusher

Eric Tarpinian, scored from two yards out



The Stroller...

Crime warnings

Every time the crime problem in the inner precincts of Detroit is mentioned these days-and it happens quite often-The Stroller is reminded of the learning he was given by his kind old mother years ago and the many brushes he has had with it through the years.

When he was leaving the old hometown a half century ago to make a bid for recognition in metropolitan journalism his mother took him aside and warned him that Detroit was one of the "wicked" cities and that he should be careful.

It was back in Prohibition days when Detroit and the down river area were centers of the rum-running industry, and murders among the various gangs were not uncom-

"I want you to take good care." Mother said. "and I want you to live at the YMCA. There shouldn't be any danger

Fine. But when The Stroller arrived on a dark, dreary afternoon in February he was confronted with his first problem.

Reporting at the Downtown "Y" he was told that there was not a room available. but that lodging could be obtained in a small hotel located in what was considered a "tough" area For that reason he walked home from the Free Press building every night with great caution

Fortunately no one ever approached him or threatened him. He began wondering if he was being kidded especially when folks whom he never had seen before spoke to him on the street

Then early one morning he got the surprise of his life-up to that point

Walking up Woodward Avenue shortly after midnight, because it was well lighted, he noticed a big, black limousine pull up to the curb in front of Grinnell's Music House. The driver left the car, walked over to the doorway and began taking the tin cup and pencils from a blind man.

The Stroller was horrified. Imagine a blind man being robbed! But when he caught up with the limousine he noticed that it was filled with blind men. Little did he know at the time that the blind men had an agent who placed them at different areas for a "working shift" and then later collected them and listed their contributions. It wasn't crime. It was just doing business with and for the blind men.

Some time later, after The Stroller had been established in a room at the "Y" and he had become acquainted with the city. he was visited by an old friend of the family back home. He was a saloon keeper. It was during the "blind pig" days when it was illegal to sell liquor. The selling was done behind guarded doors, and Detroit was supposed to have some of the better

"I would like to visit some of your best pigs," the visitor answered when asked what he wanted most to see during his

One of the favorite "spots" in those days was run by a fellow named Al Werbe. It was the second floor of a building next to the Wolverine Hotel. So, over we went. We climbed the stairs. After Al surveyed us through the "peep" hole in the door, we were admitted.

Al was tending bar, and there was only one other customer. He was seated at a table. After the proper introductions, Al was telling The Stroller's friend about the "blind pig" business, when, of a sudden, the door opened.

"You will try to fix a horse race, will you." the intruder yelled and fired a shot that killed the customer-right there at the table. The visitor from back home couldn't get out of the place fast enough-And to the day he died he never stopped talking

On another occasion The Stroller got a real grasp of crime in the rum-running

Every Sunday night a fellow named Gus Nichols, who ran a "pig" on the westside (now the site of Joey Stable's Restaurant) and managed and coached a football team on Sunday afternoons, visited the Free Press with the line-ups and the high spots after the game.

Why not come out and visit me, some time?" he used to ask.

One Sunday night after the final edition had gone to press we decided to accept the

As we approached the west side "pig" we noticed a large crowd in front of the

'What's going on?" we asked "Gus was just shot and killed in the doorway." came the reply

It was a brutal murder. But one thing about crime in those days was the fact that the gangs murdered one anothermostly in gang wars. The ordinary residents and strollers on the streets in the inner precincts never were disturbed.

YOU SEE the products on the shelves in our stores, but how do they get there? Some products are delivered directly to the stores, but many other come in amounts to our Distribution Centers. For instance, grocery products arrive daily at our Lansing Distribution Center by rail. The box cars go right through the Distribution Center for unloading. It's no accident — the building was designed with railroad tracks straight through one side. A special forklift (which is a machine to lift heavy objects) called a unitizer, is used to unload the rail car. The product is then checked in, assigned a location and moved there.

WE MOVE FAST. Product is constantly moving in or out. What doesn't come in by rail. comes in by truck. Movement out is by the familiar red Meijer trucks you may pass on the high-
