Greenstein recount likely

Nine days after the election in Canton Township, the board of canvassers has finally certified the outcome.

The four-member board certified the vote tallies Thursday, after meeting two previous times but failing to certify because of complaints from write-in supporters.

"All of us agreed the first night we met that this election should be certified," said Floyd Fulford, chairman of Canton's board of canvassers. "But there was a lot of conflict among people in the community, and we wanted to be as fair as possible."

"If we agree with the figures on the machines and the tally books match, then we have no choice but to certify this election," Fulford said. "The law says we must. People's complaints have nothing to do with it."

WRITE-IN SUPPORTERS turned out in great numbers for all three public meetings on certification, telling the board of canvassers they wanted an investigation of votes in two precincts in particular—Precinct 10 and Precinct 9.

Precinct 10 was the large absentee ballot precinct with 124 per cent of Canton's 10,637 voters. Thom Carman and Jim Do-

nahue, co-chairmen of the Committee To Re-elect the Greenstein Team, believe that people who marked a straight ticket and also affixed write-in stickers on the ballot may have been shortchanged.

They argue that pollworkers could have missed the stickers when they were entering write-in votes on the machines by only looking at the X in the straight party box.

"Because of the physical problems and the increased possibility of human error with absentee ballots, we feel it is very likely that some of the write-in votes were missed," Carman said.

In Precinct 10, Donahue has charged, the precinct chairman disallowed write-in stickers that were crinkled to the point where 50 per cent of the sticker was unreadable. Donahue claims that the machine mangled the stickers and the voters showed a clear intent to vote for the write-in candidates. He said the crinkled stickers should have been smoothed out and counted.

Gloria Hammonds, Precinct 9 chairman, refuses to say what the policy was in Precinct 9 on counting crinkled write-in stickers.

Carman, spokesman of the write-in group, said Friday that the write-in group was not demoralized by the board of can-

vassers certification. He said he has learned the investigation of alleged improprieties will not necessarily end just because the local board of canvassers has certified the election vote figures.

"A lot of our people's feelings were that if the board of canvassers certified the election totals then no one else would take a look," Carman said. "Talking to Mr. (Joseph) Martina and Mr. (Orville) Tungate, that evidently is not the case. A recount, for example, opens up any matters to investigation."

DEPUTY CLERK TUNGATE and Martina, director of elections of Wayne County, appeared at Thursday night's Canton vote certification meeting in Canton.

Tungate explained that there are three methods of election investigation open to write-in supporters, should they wish to press the issue.

"If there are irregularities, there are a number of avenues open to you after vote certification," Tungate said. "The first is to file a criminal complaint with the prosecutor's office. Second, you may file a formal complaint with the secretary of state's office in Lansing. The third approach to investigating election complaints is accomplished in the structure of the

recount. Instruct them as to where you think errors exist, and the county board of canvassers comes in and takes a look."

A recount request from lame duck Supervisor Robert Greenstein appears to be the most likely approach.

GREENSTEIN, who lost by 454 votes, said he has not yet made up his mind on whether he will demand a recount. To demand a recount, a candidate must submit a request to the county board of canvassers within six days of certification.

A candidate pays \$5 per precinct he wants inspected, and the township would

pay the county employees to do the check. Carman said the write-in supporters haven't met yet to decide a plan of action, if any.

"You investigate different things in different ways," Carman said. "For example, a complaint about misinformation given out by pollworkers would be handled by the prosecutor if it was just one instance and by the secretary of state if we found it was widespread."

"This election was so damn complex," said Carman. "That's part of the problem to begin with. We had the problem of absentee ballots and the physical problem of

counting write-in votes. Both those things open up the chance of human error."

Carman said he expects to meet with Greenstein in the next few days to talk about the possibility of having Greenstein demand a recount.

"The possibility is pretty strong," Carman said. "Honestly, we haven't decided what we're going to do. We'll see how Bob (Greenstein) feels and determine whether it's worthwhile."

"Our position is that we want to make sure this election is as fair and proper as possible."

Windsor Woods apts. nullified after 7 years

Site plans for a 153-unit apartment complex at the northwest corner of Warren and Morton Taylor roads was declared "null and void" seven years after original approval.

The nullification vote took place last week—the last official board meeting of the Greenstein administration.

In March 1969, the Canton board approved the building of 98 apartments and 55 townhouses (condominiums) at Windsor Park. Because of homeowner opposition to rented apartments, the prior board in February 1972 changed the site plans by asking the second owner (Slavik) to build 90 condominiums.

Just about that time, the market on condominiums fell through. So, Canton's board reportedly made an oral agreement to allow Slavik to build 153 apartments on the site which is next to Windsor Park subdivision.

Last week's action said, in effect, that the board was not bound by that oral agreement which would amend the Planned Unit Development (P.U.D.) contract.

The vote on Tuesday was 5-1 to nullify the site plan with James Poole holding the minority opinion. Trustee Bob Myers was absent.

The vote to nullify the site plan was greeted by applause from many members of the audience who live in Windsor Park.

"Our bottom line right now for that piece of property is to see single-family homes built there," said William Botwick, of 7424 Pointe, spokesman for the homeowners.

Gerald T. Odum was not pleased with the reception he got from the homeowners and the majority of the board.

"I left the township meeting two weeks ago hoping to meet with the Windsor Park homeowner group to reach some kind of compromise," Odum said. "I was available, they were not. Finally we set something up. I came prepared to make certain concessions. First, I agreed to build a six-foot fence when only a five-foot fence is required by code. I offered to increase the height of the fence to seven or eight feet if that was desired and split the cost of any height over six feet with the homeowners."

"Our plans have been revised and revised. I got you greater setback of the buildings in two different cases. I agreed to eliminate 20 per cent of the parking spaces as long as it didn't involve further time delays and was not in violation of the township's ordinance. I did this after hearing your complaints."

Odum ended his speech with a plea for equal treatment for builders.

Both Odum and Supervisor Robert Green-

stein admitted that the board's action could very well be the subject of a lawsuit started by Slavik.

Four apartment units are already on the property. These were originally built to be sold as mortgaged condos, but were rented as apartments.

Greenstein said the P.U.D. agreement could be interpreted to allow Slavik to build 90 townhouses (condos), but he said he felt confident that the township would be on good legal footing by denying construction of 149 new apartment units.

Noting that the complex is a \$3 million project, Greenstein said that he did not feel they had seen the "bottom line in a future compromise."

Teachers in the Plymouth Community School District are now in their 10th week of working without a contract and there's no indication of a settlement between the teachers union and the school board.

Negotiations are at a standstill; it appears the stalemate will continue, possibly until the end of the year. But even though progress has stopped at the bargaining table, the possibility of a strike is not imminent.

Basically, negotiations are in a state of limbo as the teacher union is struggling to find a way to apply pressure for a favorable contract—short of a strike. The school board, knowing the chances of a strike are slim, has drawn the line and has no real motivation to move any further.

The present status is that the school board negotiation team is meeting once a week with the Plymouth Education Association (PEA) team to keep lines of communication open, but there's almost no bargaining occurring.

THE KEY to the current stalemate lies in the decision of the Michigan Court of Appeals upholding the right of the Crestwood School District administration to fire its faculty for striking.

That legal ruling provides that any school district may discharge any striking teacher so long as due process is provided. If a school board holds sufficient hearings on each individual instructor, then all teachers can be fired for going on strike.

The impact of that ruling has been very real for both sides. The school board, armed with clear authority to use dismissal to prevent a strike, is "feeling its oats" and feels more secure in drawing the line at the table because it is fairly confident the ultimate weapon—the strike—won't be used.

The PEA, likewise, is fearful of the consequences of using the strike as a bargaining weapon because of the possible consequence of teachers being fired. In 1976, more so than any other year, superintendents and school board spokesmen in Wayne and Oakland counties have verbally made known their intentions to fire teachers if a strike occurs.

Whether true or not, the teachers union has perceived that school districts in the metropolitan area have decided to use the dismissal threat to stop faculties from calling a strike. It may not be collusion, but superintendents throughout the metropolitan area are speaking the same language and the drum beat sounds much the same.

Thus, a strike is likely to be called only as a measure of last resort—if at all. The PEA, of course, will never admit that it has no intention of striking but the local situation will have to become much worse then it is now before a strike occurs.

Chance of teachers striking is slim

The fact is that the strike, traditionally the key bargaining weapon, has been stripped away from teachers as an effective tool. In 1976 the risk of calling a strike is so great that it is almost a useless tool for a single school district.

There is, however, the possibility of a strike in Plymouth of a very limited duration. Because of the mechanics of offering

courts in hopes that the legal system would sustain its right to strike. Failing that, the union now must turn to the legislature for relief or to the streets.

With the legislature reconvening this month, what might occur is an area-wide escalation of strife between unions and school boards to demonstrate to Lansing the need for timely remedy. Otherwise, legislators are likely to stall on this issue as they did all last year.

IT WOULD BE faulty to assume that the Plymouth Board of Education is insisting that teachers "sell short" because of the board's newly-found authority to be tough at the table.

In Plymouth both sides have been bargaining in good faith and the problems at the table are relatively minor compared to incidents which have occurred in other school districts.

The prime motivation of the school board is not to make an offer which would require the district to use any part of the additional 4.75 voted mills for operation for teachers' salary. During the millage campaign, the board pledged the added tax would be spent to improve educational programs and would not be used toward teachers salaries. Having made that public pledge, the board is determined to keep that promise.

It appears the board's latest offer, a 30 per cent improvement over three years counting increments and pension contributions, is the highest it can go without using some of the funds generated by the new millage. The PEA, however, is less than sure this is the case.

But the line is drawn at 30 per cent improvement over three years and the board seems resolute that the offer won't be raised.

THE PEA isn't really interested in bargaining for any part of the 4.75 mills for the first year's contract.

What appears to be the main concern for the PEA is the impact inflation will have on their buying power over the next three years. If a one-year pact were in the offing, a settlement might already have been reached. But teachers would like to see some improvement in their buying power during the next three years and have little reason to believe inflation won't drop much below the seven to eight per cent level per year.

Another factor is how much of the 30 per cent the PEA is willing to accept as salary improvement. The school board suggests the entire 30 per cent is an improvement because it represents more money in the teachers' pocketbooks at each pay period.

The PEA, however, recognizes that the contribution to the pension fund is a requirement of state law and one the board would have to offer regardless of what agreements are reached at the bargaining table. The PEA also does not recognize increment (salary hike based on seniority and education) raises as a salary improvement because not all teachers receive increments. From the PEA's standpoint, a contract negotiated needs to include gains for all teachers and any money which all teachers don't receive isn't a negotiated improvement.

But the battle over increments is almost a flag waving tactic. Regardless of all the arguments the PEA puts forth against increments, it is very likely a settlement would be reached if the total money package was desirable.

But during November there is little likelihood a settlement will be reached. Although the PEA is negotiating for its own local contract, the teacher's team isn't ignorant of the plight of the MEA and neighboring districts. The Plymouth contract status is now in a period of waiting to see if the legislature will act, to see if regional action will be taken, or to see whether the showdown ought to be delayed until September 1977.

Graduation senior's contest entries were judged on the basis of leadership potential reflected in community and extra-curricular activities, high scores on a current events exam and on their written viewpoints about America's needs for the future.

Wales now will compete with other high school winners from around the state for two \$1,000 scholarships and an opportunity for the \$10,000 top national scholarship.

Two Michigan winners will receive an all-expense-paid trip to the second annual Century III Leaders Meeting in Williamsburg, Va. in March.

Symphony concert is Sunday

Keum Ja Kim, the coloratura soprano who drew rave reviews earlier this year when she performed at the pop concert, will be guest soloist at the Nov. 21 concert of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra.

The May concert was a sellout, leaving many disappointed would-be concert-goers. Sunday's concert at 4 p.m. in the Plymouth Salem High School auditorium has the seating capacity to accommodate a larger audience.

The petite soprano—she's 5-foot-2 and weighs barely 100 pounds—has an astonishing voice which fills the hall. She will sing the "Aria" by Mozart. After intermission she will join the orchestra for "Four Last Songs" by Richard Strauss.

MISS KIM sang with the Children's Choir of Korea as an orphan child. The choir was brought to America by the late Ed Sullivan for a television performance.

With that group, she sang in 28 foreign countries. In time she arrived at the Interlochen Arts Academy and was befriended by another young student, Karen McAllister, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William McAllister of Plymouth.

She was a houseguest in the McAllister's home many times and was soloist with the choir at First United Presbyterian Church of Plymouth on more than one occasion.

Roscoe Bonisteel, Ann Arbor attorney and former University of Michigan regent, took the talented Miss Kim under his wing and helped her through U-M. She has her masters degree and is working on her doctorate.

CONDUCTOR WAYNE DUNLAP has chosen Coates' "London Suite" to open the program. This will be followed by the Mozart "Aria" with Miss Kim. Elgar's Variations on an Original Theme ("Enigma") will complete the first half of the program.

The Plymouth Symphony League will serve coffee in the lobby during intermission.

The last half of the program is completely Richard Strauss. Keum Ja Kim's "Four Last Songs" and then waltzes from "Der Rosenkavalier" to close the concert.

Richard Strauss, born in Munich, Germany in 1864, is best known for his operas and symphonic poems. Although he composed a march when he was 12 years old,

he studied law and philosophy at the University of Munich.

Later, he was persuaded to become a conductor and he wrote "Don Juan," "Don

Central Lot is topic tonight

Proposed improvements for the Central Parking Lot will be discussed tonight as part of the first in a series of meetings on parking problems in the City of Plymouth.

Merchants who are serviced by the Central Lot are encouraged to attend the information sharing session, says City Manager Fred Yockey. It will be held during the committee-of-the-whole session immediately following the regular meeting of the city commission.

The commission meeting begins at 7:30 p.m. in the chambers upstairs in city hall.

THE PARKING session was scheduled two weeks ago after the commission received from its parking committee a summary of recommendations on parking policy, problems and solutions.

Commissioner Thomas Turner chaired the parking committee. Other members were City Commissioners Beverly McAninch, Mary Childs and Planning Commissioners Kenneth Christensen, David Pugh and William Leonard.

No immediate expansion of the Central Lot is recommended. What is recommended is that about \$40,000 be spent to resurface, restripe the lot, and relocate the Harvey Street entrance and exit areas and relocate the Ann Arbor Trail entrance gate control.

The committee also has asked the city's planning consultants, Vilcan-Leman, to develop suggestions for merchants to improve the appearance of their properties adjacent to the parking lot so the Central Lot can become an attraction in itself, similar to Eastern Market in Detroit.

In months to come the city commission will hold information sharing meetings with merchants by Wiedman Lot, Fralick Street, Old Village and Peniman Lot. Once input is gained, the city commission then hopes to agree on a general approach and philosophy to parking before approving any specific plans.

People wait in long queue to guard against swine flu

As those of you who were still standing in line at Plymouth Salem High School last Wednesday evening when the doors closed know, not everyone who wanted one got a swine flu vaccination.

Although an exact number has not been calculated, Doug Vilnius, vaccine coordinator for Wayne County, said there were many, many people left waiting outside in line at 9 p.m.

According to Vilnius, there are no definite plans for another clinic in the immediate Plymouth area. However, he said there would be a make-up clinic at the Westland Shopping Center Nov. 20 from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m.

"We will be administering both the bivalent and monovalent vaccine at Westland," commented Vilnius. "And anybody who was not inoculated during the regular clinic should plan on coming out to the make-up."

Bivalent is a mixture of swine flu and "A" Victoria flu vaccines. It will be given to people 60 years of age and older and to people 18 years of age and older who have a chronic disease, such as heart trouble, respiratory illness, or kidney infection.

The monovalent vaccine is only for swine flu and will be given to anybody age 18 to 59. Vilnius also said there would be a special clinic for chronically ill children who are between the ages of 3 and 17. It will be held today through Nov. 19 at the Wayne County Health Center on Merriman Road. The hours for each of the five days will be: 9-11 a.m. and 1-4 p.m.

Children under the age of 18 who are not chronically ill will not be inoculated.

THE SCENE AT Wednesday's clinic at Plymouth Salem was somewhat less than chaotic. According to one participant, traffic at one time was backed up from the high school all the way to Haggerty and Joy roads.

And lines leading to and inside the building were no better. People were stacked up and twisted around the entire school area.

There were complaints from some people who waited in line in their cars for more than an hour and never got into the parking lot.

According to health department figures, 2,344 shots were given before the doors closed at 9 p.m., but there is not even an unofficial guess as to how many were turned away.

"I know a lot of people are wondering why we closed the clinic when we did," remarked Vilnius. "There were several factors involved in our decision."

"First, we had agreed with school officials to vacate the building at 9 p.m. And

secondly—and this is the main reason—our volunteers had been working without a break since 2 o'clock in the afternoon, and they were getting very tired.

"I know I don't have to tell you that when people get tired, they make mistakes, and in circumstances like this, the one thing you want to avoid is a mistake."

"So we made the decision to close the doors. I'm sorry that people were inconvenienced, but we had to consider the general welfare," Vilnius concluded.

The large turnout came as somewhat of a surprise to health department officials who hope residents will take advantage of the make-up clinic.

"There is a very slim possibility that we might hold another clinic in the Plymouth area sometime after Nov. 20," Vilnius speculated. "But right now we don't know if money will be available."

"To be on the safe side, individuals who want the vaccine should attend the Westland make-up."

Bundarin's dog gone

Peter Bundarin and his family can't seem to keep Irish setters in their home.

The second set of Irish setters owned by the Bundarin family recently disappeared from the family's backyard in Holiday Park subdivision.

Bundarin, the defeated Republican candidate for Canton Township supervisor, is offering a \$100 reward for information leading to the return of the six-month-old purebred pups.

The puppies—a male and female responding to the names "Shane" and "Shannon"—are wearing chain collars. Bundarin said. Neither puppy wears a license tag, since the dogs are still too young for rabies shots.

Bundarin is particularly anxious for return of Shane male, since the puppy requires surgery to prevent the possible onset of cancer.

Bundarin said the dogs disappeared from his backyard a week before the Nov. 2 election, when a section of his redwood fence was knocked down apparently from the outside.

He said he kept quiet about the incident when it occurred, for fear any publicity would be interpreted as politically self-serving.

Bundarin, who has already contacted the Wayne County Sheriff's Department about the incident, said he suspects the dogs may have been stolen.

"I'm not sure what happened," he said. "I'm suspicious."

The puppies are the second set of Irish setters which have disappeared from Bundarin's home. Another Irish setter, a young adult, disappeared from the Holiday Park home about a year ago, when the dog leaped out Bundarin's front door.

The missing puppies were purchased to replace the run-away.

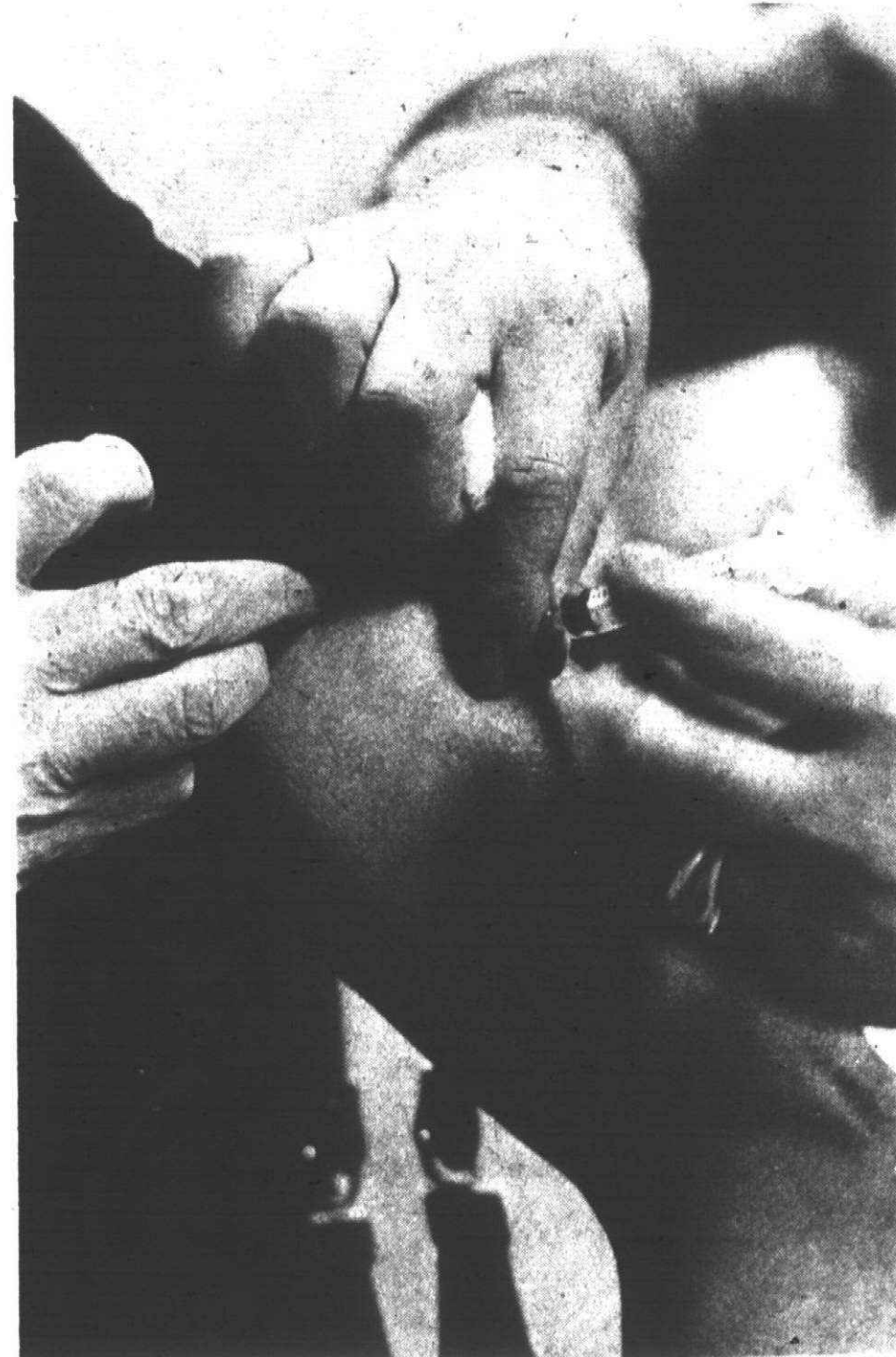
"We got two this time, because we figured they wouldn't be lonely and run away," Bundarin explained. "We've had them since they were four-weeks-old, and they were inseparable. When one went outside, the other went outside, too."

"The kids are upset again," he continued. "They got more attached to these two than the other."

Asked whether he'd purchase more Irish setters to replace the lost pups, Bundarin responded, "Not while I live here I won't, and I don't plan on moving. Let's just say I'm suspicious of this one."

Or there would be the great drought in the Oklahoma plains as we built a dam with weeds, brush, boards and mud. And then, just when it appeared the entire settlement would flourish, the dam would open, water would come gushing down into the valley, and the crops were saved.

The wooded area (none dare call it a forest) was a good setting for playing cowboy and Indians, pioneer settler, hunter or trapper, or Eskimo on huskie-driven sled.

There also was an abandoned well out in the woods that our parents didn't know about that provided hours of fun. And there was the schoolhouse woodshed, coal bin and roof which our parents did know about but was great to play in or on as long as we remained out of sight.

The main thing about all of this is that we were entertained by our imaginations or the fields, woods and ditches—not by toys. And children today are just as imaginative as we were. My purely personal prejudice is that a child doesn't need a Dinkie Doris doll that can wet her pants—with imagination, any old doll can wet her pants.

Cancer patients helped

The office at 173 N. Main in Plymouth is more than an office; it is the home of the Michigan Cancer Foundation (MCF).

It provides medical services and equipment to local cancer patients, conducts educational programs, sponsors free pap and oral test clinics and fields contributions to hospital research.

Volunteers are busy from 1-3 p.m. each weekday distributing gauze, petroleum jelly and other medical dressings to about 40 area patients. Wheelchairs, walkers, hospital beds and other equipment are available from the MCF loan closet without charge.

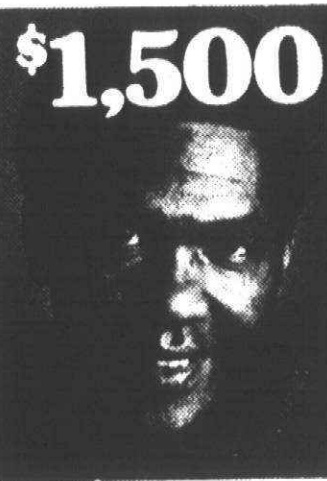
VOLUNTEERS ALSO log hundreds of miles each month transporting patients to therapy centers and spend additional hours staffing the periodic testing clinics.

They help distribute brochures, films and educational materials to individuals and groups on request. An annual Christmas card sale and other special activities augment the local budget and help support medical research.

But most of the money donated to the MCF through the Plymouth Community Fund is directly channeled to local residents. The Community Fund welcomes donations either by mail to P.O. Box 345, Plymouth, or by payroll deduction. Residents who work in nearby communities are reminded to designate their donation be returned to Plymouth.

The loan closet and medical supplies assist local cancer patients, but other MCF services—the free test clinics, educational programs and medical research—benefit the entire community. They have helped many Plymouth residents detect cancer in its early stages, and obtain treatment which may have saved their lives.

The Stroller... Working under pressure

Our rock-ribbed Republican luncheon guest tossed aside the paper showing President Ford on the golf course at Palm Springs and consoled himself for the recent setback in the election by saying, "Well, he's out from under the pressure."

Our guest possibly didn't mean to, but he opened up an entire discussion of working under pressure. There was no denying that the man sitting in the Oval Office in the White House is under pressure of the

heaviest kind. But he is not alone in working with the burden of public opinion on his shoulders.

To get away from politics another guest at the table, innocently asked, "Is there any pressure any greater than that faced by young Bobby Wood, the University of Michigan place kicker, last week down at Lafayette, Ind., when he was called upon in the last few seconds to stave off impending defeat."

He was asked to kick a field goal from an odd angle that meant the difference between victory and defeat—and a share of the Big Ten title and a trip to the Rose Bowl.

It was ironical that only two years ago Mike Lantry, another Michigan back, was in the same position in the title game with Ohio State.

Mike missed and it seemed the entire stadium caved in. He later admitted that in those few moments he was under the heaviest pressure of his career. He hinted, at the time, that even his teammates turned on him and that it was a moment he never would be able to live down.

AS THE CONVERSATION continued The Stroller injected the thought that of all the athletes he has seen in action no one is under more pressure than the boxing champions.

"How would you have liked to be Joe Louis in the second fight with Schmeling," The Stroller asked. "He hadn't forgotten the first fight when he suffered his first knockout. But Joe worked his way out of the pressure with one of the most devastating onslaughts of his career. He stopped Schmeling in the first round and laid claim to rating as the best heavyweight champion of all time. He had conquered pressure of worst kind—the pressure of facing an opponent who is bent on doing bodily harm."

All the while the conversation went on The Stroller sat there, chucking inwardly, at the thought that when it comes to pressure there are few moments that equal those as the copy deadline approaches on a metropolitan daily newspaper, or any other newspaper for that matter.

WELL HE RECALLS the evening in Yankee Stadium in New York when Joe Louis lay on the ring floor being counted out for the first time in his career.

The crowds were screaming and yelling

and climbing into the ring to greet the beetle-browed German.

In all that bedlam, the telegraph instrument at the ringside began to click. The operator bent over, listened intently in all that din, and said, "It's a message for you. The office says there is trouble in the mailing room and they must have your complete story in 45 minutes."

Talk about pressure—that was it. Just imagine trying to write the biggest sports story of the year with shouting and yelling all around. But somehow or other The Stroller managed to get the job done and beat the deadline by just a little more than a minute.

It was an assignment he never will forget.

Then there was the afternoon in the newsroom of the Free Press that became one of the great newspaper tales.

At the time Williams Jennings Bryan, one of the great Democrats and presidential candidates was laying on his death bed. The afternoon Detroit News was on the street with a big headline—"Bryan Sinking."

IT WAS ONLY a half hour until the Free Press deadline and there was scurrying around for a new "angle" on the Bryan story to help offset the News headline.

Just about then came the flash, "Bryan dead."

As the word passed from the wire room to the city desk, Art Duncan, then the city editor, got up and shouted: "That's the first thing he ever has done for the Republicans—he died for the first edition."

Pressure—there's always plenty of it as the copy deadline approaches in the big city newsrooms.

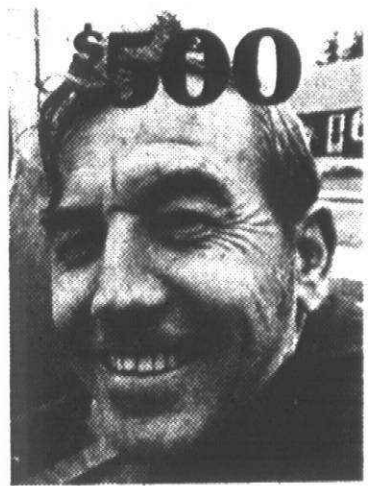
But it is just part of the newspaper "game" that makes it so interesting.

Eddie Edgar gets 'icing' on his birthday cake

W.W. "Eddie" Edgar received an unusual and unexpected birthday gift last week.

The feature writer for the Plymouth Observer, who helped build St. Mary Hospital and incorporate the City of Livonia, will have the Ford athletic center and ice rink at Ford Field in Livonia named after him to honor his longtime contributions to sports in Michigan.

EDGAR, who will be 79 Friday, has been a newspaperman for 56 years—the last 10 as an Observer reporter, editor and columnist and winner of numerous awards for his popular "The Stroller" column.

He also worked for the Detroit Free Press sports department for more than 20 years and was the newspaper's sports editor in the 1930s and '40s.

Edgar has been active in the Plymouth community for many years serving as a member of the Rotary Club of Plymouth, as former editor of the Plymouth Observer, and providing the leadership for a "sister city" exchange with Plymouth, England, which marked the Michigan Plymouth's 100th anniversary as a city.

LIVONIA city council is expected to discuss tonight the suggestion of Councilman Bob Bishop to rename the athletic center as the "Eddie Edgar Sports Arena." The

council will formally take action on the proposal the following week.

Bishop said he first thought of the honor last summer when talking with Edgar about the early days of Livonia's city government, which was organized in 1950 after charter approval. He admitted that he hadn't informed Edgar of his suggestion to rename the Ford athletic center in his honor.

"But I'd tell Eddie to his face that we love you and want to express our sincere appreciation for what you've done. What better way to honor him than to be surrounded by the cheers of youngsters."

Edgar has had three careers, two involving sports, during his life. He started out as sports writer and during his career with the Free Press, conducted Detroit's first Golden Gloves boxing tournament. During that same period, he was one of the first to discover Joe Louis who went on to become heavyweight champion of the world, a title he held for 11 years.

Edgar became interested in bowling in 1938 and initiated numerous major tournaments which ultimately were copied throughout the nation. He also started a junior bowling program in the Detroit area and organized a youth association which now has 36,000 members. He also started

after-school bowling leagues for youngsters.

EDGAR LEFT the Free Press and headed the state's bowling proprietors' association and used the sport to benefit numerous activities.

In 1954, Edgar was named national bowling chairman for the March of Dimes campaign and established a nationwide tournament which has raised an estimated \$2 million in eight years, the first of its kind in the country.

He eventually was inducted into the bowling hall of fame in 1962.

Langell carves tall ships

It's been almost two decades since Charlie Langell left Marine City to take residence in Canton Township, but he never lost his love for the ships that cut through the waters of the St. Clair River.

He developed a natural love for ships inasmuch as his grandparents—even his great grandparents—were ship builders in the old days.

No longer at an age when he can take an active part with other sailors in the area, he has turned to carving ships out of wood. He takes great delight in building ships inside of bottles and light bulbs.

But his real masterpiece is a replica of the Mayflower that brought the Pilgrims to America in 1620. The replica, the result of more than 553 hours of labor, is now on display in the lobby of the Mayflower Hotel where it was given to innkeeper Ralph Lorenz as a gift on the start of the 50th year of the hotel.

Charlie stood at the table where his latest creation rested and proudly stated it is a real model, built to scale, and exclaimed: "Every plank is nailed down just as in the original ship—and all parts work."

To assure that it would be an official replica Charlie sent to England for the drawings of the old ship and, strangely, he got them.

"They came drawn one eighth of an inch to the foot and I had to redraw them to seventh eighth of an inch to the foot to get a boat three feet long. It took me a month

just to get the drawings the way I wanted them, but here it is—one of the most enjoyable jobs I have ever done."

While telling of his work on the model, Charlie, says he didn't launch his wood carving career until several years ago.

"All my life, I was the type of a fellow who, when he wanted something done, went out and did it."

How did he ever get started in wood carving when he was past 60 years of age? "I had a desire for a wood carving of the old time pony express," he answered, "and some of those old-time western scenes. So, I got me some wood and carved them."

"Don't get me wrong, I had pictures. From these I drew plans, and then started carving. I always admired the fellows who could carve, and I had a lot of fun doing it."

Along about that stage in his career Charlie, eager to get all the information he could, contacted "a fellow named Crabtree and got a lot of advice from him."

After carving his pony express, Charlie started looking for other projects and settled on carving ships—not the models of the freighters he has seen in his youth on the St. Clair River but the big sailing ships.

Hawks gain playoff with 28-14 victory

Harrison beats mistake-proned Rocks

Farmington Harrison's season-long dream for an undefeated record and a state playoff berth came true Saturday afternoon with a 28-14 victory over the Plymouth Rocks.

The Hawks, champions of the Western Six League, had to come from behind to pull the victory out, as Salem mistakes led to three of the Harrison touchdowns.

The statistics showed a totally different ball game, as the Rocks dominated most of the action with 320 yards rushing, to only 137 for Harrison.

The difference was Harrison's ability to capitalize on two Salem fumbles and a blocked punt for three touchdowns.

"It was an even football game, but you can't expect to win when you make mistakes," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer.

HARRISON'S TOM REYNOLDS started the game with a bang, returning Salem's opening kickoff 89 yards down the left sideline for a touchdown. Brett Homovec converted his first of four extra point kicks, and Harrison had a 7-0 lead after 13 seconds of action.

The Rocks came back strong, running a troublesome option offense that led to two touchdowns on their first two possessions.

Salem drove 75 and 41 yards for the two scores, led by a brilliant performance by sophomore quarterback Rich Hewlett.

Hewlett bulled over from two yards out for the first touchdown, and halfback Steve Maisner danced in from three 11 for the second. Bob Waite kicked both conversions, and the Rocks held a 14-7 margin after eight minutes of play.

But from that point, it was all Harrison as the defense tightened and the offense controlled the ball, thanks to their potential all-state tailback, Mike Bowden.

The Hawks scored 14 points of their own in the second quarter.

Harrison's Jerry Prescott recovered a Rock fumble at the Salem 42, and five plays later, the score was tied 14-14 when Bowden crashed over from the two.

The Hawks blocked a Salem punt with 1:38 left in the first half, and quarterback Jeff Thorne quickly engineered a six play, 47 yard drive in less than a minute to give Harrison the lead for good.

Bowden pushed his way over the right side from three yards out for the score.

The Hawks stopped Salem on the first possession of the third period and capitalized when the Rocks' punt attempt went only 10 yards because of a fumbled snap.

A clutch catch by Bert Barsch for 28 yards sent the Hawks to Salem's three yard line, where Bowden scored the final touchdown two plays later.

"We controlled the ball better (in the second half) and kept it away from them," said elated Harrison coach John Herrington. "We tightened up on defense, but

(Salem coach) Moshimer's something else. He knows where to attack you."

Bowden was the main force behind the controlled Hawk offense, gaining 128 yards in 27 carries.

Harrison moves into next Saturday's state playoffs at Wisner Field in Pontiac, while Salem ended the season with a 5-4 record.

It's no contest, 27-0

Dearborn demolishes Chiefs

Another Plymouth Canton football season came to an end Friday night—the same way the past three seasons have ended.

The Chiefs hosted the powerful Dearborn Pioneers at the Centennial Park field and it simply was no contest, as 27 first half Pioneer points marked all the scoring in the contest.

And the score would have been worse than the 27-0 count if Dearborn hadn't played flatter than a pancake.

Thank heavens, for Canton's sake, that Dearborn receivers failed to catch three potential touchdown strikes when they were in the clear. And thank heavens that the Pioneers did not push the ball across the end zone in the second half, despite two different opportunities. And thank heavens Dearborn played its second stringers in the final quarter.

If these factors did not exist, the score could have easily run into the 50s or 60s.

"They were as big as Garden City East," said Canton coach Dave Schuele

after the game. "But you could tell the difference in Dearborn's quickness. They are the same caliber as a Harrison."

"I thought if we could go down and hit a quick one and force them to make a mistake (then we'd have a chance)."

"I thought they would come in flat but they obviously weren't. They were ready to play."

Canton's offense could not muster a single threat in the whole game, despite getting the ball deep in the Pioneers' territory on two occasions in the third period.

The Chiefs recorded a meager total of 63 yards on offense the entire game.

Dearborn was "just too much physically. We were out-manned," Schuele said.

Dearborn scored on each of its four possessions of the first half and controlled the ball for most of the second, despite not putting any more points on the board.

The Pioneers' first score was an eight-play drive in 65 yards as fullback Chuck Baughman crossed the goal line. After a Chief penalty, Dearborn decided to try for two points and was successful with senior

Eric Tarpinian romping up the middle.

Tarpinian ran around left end for the Pioneers' second touchdown, with nine minutes remaining in the second quarter. Norm Lockwood kicked the extra point for the 15-0 lead.

On the ensuing kickoff, a Pioneer squib kick hit off a Canton lineman and was recovered by Dearborn on the 50 yard line.

Five minutes and 12 plays later, Tarpinian bucked over from the one for the six points. The kick failed but the Pioneers held a 21-0 margin.

That kickoff is "what really hurt us," Schuele said. "They scored twice without us getting our hands on the football."

The final score of the night came with only 31 seconds left in the first half when the Pioneers punched in one more touchdown on a six-play 35-yard drive. Quarterback Dennis Scula hit Lockwood on a squareout pattern for the 16 yard score.

The Chiefs' two chances in the second half started when Cliff Norris recovered the opening half kickoff on Dearborn's 24. But the Chiefs failed to move farther than the 16, as the drive stalled.

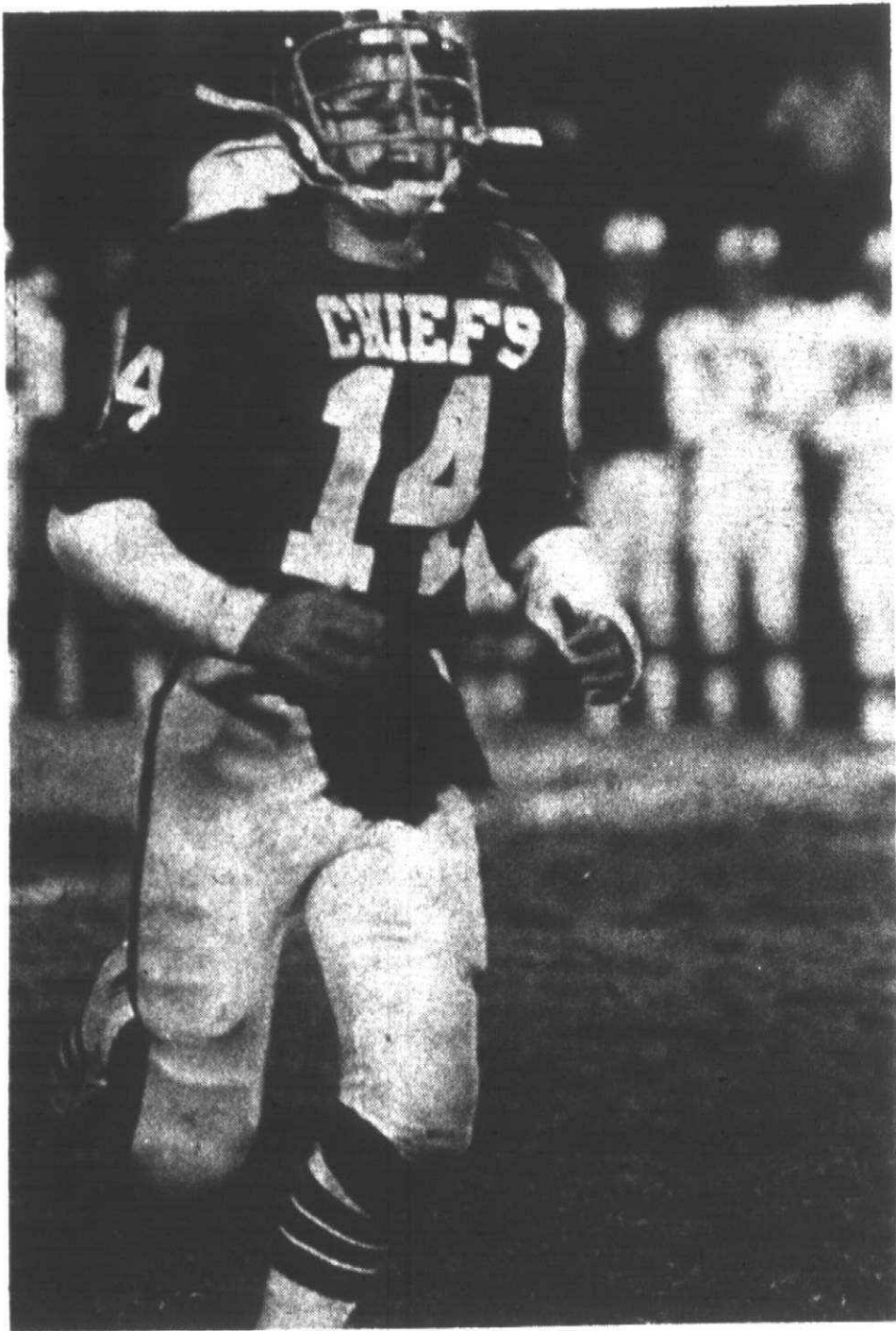

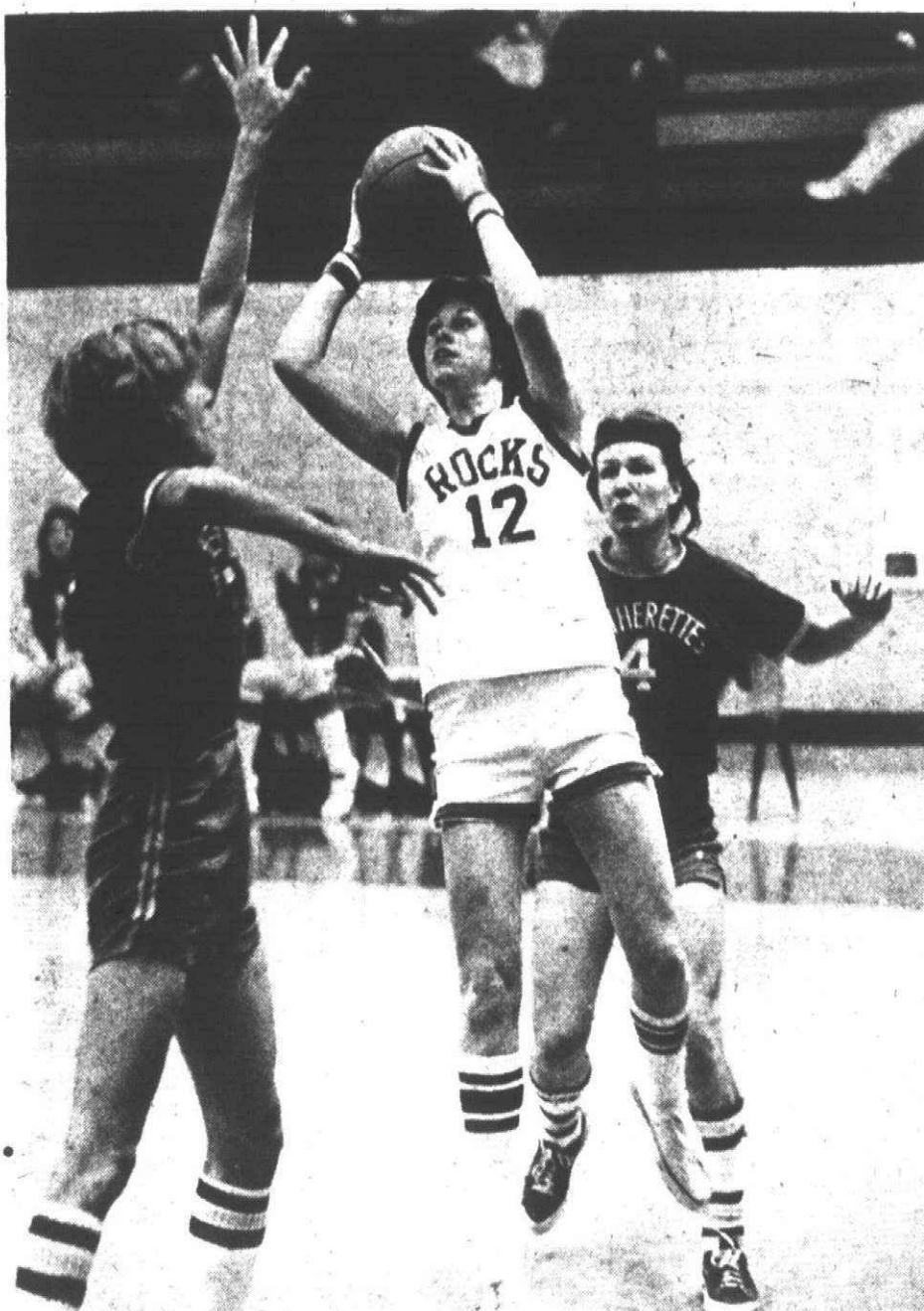
The Rocks shot a meager 24 per cent from the floor in the first half, but increased that to 36 per cent in the final two quarters.

There's nothing like a new hobby at 82

At 85, Mrs. Pearl Keefer of Plymouth Township is a working woman. Hunched over a dining room table in her granddaughter's home on Beck, Mrs. Kee-

fer carefully strings rows of colored glass, wooden and metallic beads on fine chains of gold and silver mesh. The jewelry—mostly chokers and orna-

mental chains—are then distributed to a Westland beauty salon and Gallerie II, a Plymouth arts and crafts shop on Penniman, where they are offered for sale.

Mrs. Keefer's jewelry-making work is not a life-long occupation, but work started when the silver-haired woman was 82.

"I never made jewelry when I was younger," confessed the soft-spoken woman in her granddaughter's beam-roofed living room. "I had three kids, and I just didn't have the time."

"Mostly, it's been a hobby since I came to Plymouth—something to pass the time."

Formerly of Detroit, Mrs. Keefer came to live with her granddaughter and her husband, Marilyn and Thomas Husband, three years ago. It was then that Mrs. Husband suggested the jewelry-making art.

So at 82—an age seldom considered as a starting point for a new career—Mrs. Keefer began the jewelry-making business, work that has taken her to arts and crafts shows in Plymouth and Westland and two retail shops.

The elderly Plymouth Township resident works as a salesperson two Saturdays a month at Gallerie II in exchange for having her work displayed at the shop.

"That's the part I like least," she confessed.

But Mrs. Keefer does enjoy creating the ornamental chokers and chains, each of which takes about 45 minutes to make.

"It's just interesting," she said. "Some days, I make three or four pieces of jewelry. Some days, I just make one, and some days I don't make any."

Besides providing extra spending money to Mrs. Keefer, the hobby has kept her as well as her relatives well stocked with jewelry.

"I, my daughter and my granddaughter are well supplied," she laughed. "They make a nice little extra gift for someone."
