Force handcuffed, says reservist

Patrols cut back in austerity move

One patrol car has been taken off the street in an austerity program directed by Canton Supervisor Harold Stein who announced Monday that if the police department continues to operate at its present rate, it will be \$11,670 over budget at the end of 1977.

Two patrol cars and the police chief's car will continue to patrol Canton from 6 p.m. to 11 p.m. on weekdays and 10 a.m. to 11 p.m. on weekends.

From Aug. 4 to Nov. 12, \$14,619.75 was spent on the reserves, according to Stein. This was before officer certification.

"With the certification of 15 reserves and an increase in rate of pay from \$2.30 per hour to \$3.83 per hour and \$5.01 (an hour) for command certified officers, the

dollar amount spent on reserves now increases," Stein states in a letter to trustees.

Basing his figures on 35 reserves, Stein said if the current rate of man (and woman) hours continues, the reserves will have worked 22,256 hours by the end of 1977, or an average of approximately 52 hours per month. Stein said that would mean that the township would be forced to pay out \$59,670 in a department that was budgeted at \$48,000.

In his letter Stein did not use the term "regular police." He refers to the officers as "certified" and "non-certified" reserves. Stein said his new directive "adds up to putting the police department back on a part-time basis." The supervisor said he is concerned about the fact that any employee who works more than 20 hours per

week for five months is considered full-time under the terms of the township employee pension contract.

"The township cannot afford any additional fringes that would have to be paid to these police reserves," Stein said. "We are now carrying life insurance on the reserves at \$13.80 per month per man and liability insurance which costs \$2,478. If employees were fulltime they would also be eligible for hospitalization, social security, pension, holidays and a differential pay rate for Sundays and holidays, all of which the township certainly cannot afford, especially for a part-time police department which we are supposed to have."

Through Nov. 30, Stein claims the township has spent \$23,561.37 on police uniforms and equipment and \$21,956.38 on salaries, with "only \$16,200 currently bud-

get for the department" in 1976. This means the 1976 budget will have to be adjusted, Stein states.

His letter to the trustees claims that there were as many as 10 certified officers on duty one weekday immediately after 14 Canton officers graduated from the police academy, in addition to four non-certified reserves and a certified command officer.

"We are suggesting as a normal practice that there be two patrol cars a night with one command officer, two certified officers, two non-certified officers and a non-certified reserve acting as dispatcher," Stein stated. "The command officer could ride in one of the patrol cars, thus eliminating one of the certified officers. This one command officer will always be in radio contact."

But on Monday Stein said there would be

three cars on the road—two regular patrol cars and the third would be the police chief's car which is equipped with a radio on the Wayne County Sheriff's frequency.

Stein said the township is receiving proper police protection, since he secured "extra help from the sheriffs and state police, both are working very close with us."

During Monday night's special meeting, Stein said he would not include members of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department on the police study group "because of a cloud of suspicion that exists" over the political support he received from the sheriff's union.

But Stein went on to say that cooperation between the Canton Police and the sheriffs has been steadily improving to the

Berg will chair land use study

Two study groups—one on land use and another on police—were given first priority by the Canton Township board Tuesday night and the acting chairman was picked for the land use committee.

Bart Berg, unsuccessful Republican candidate for treasurer and former president of the Canton Chamber of Commerce, was selected by Supervisor Harold Stein as acting chairman of the land use committee. All board members but Anne Bradley voted to name Berg as chairman.

Recommended for the police study group by Stein was George Rose of 6430 Wedgewood, Canton, who is a retired Detroit police inspector.

Since Rose's name was unfamiliar to most of the board, Trustee Lynne Goldsmith asked to table his appointment until next Tuesday's meeting to afford the board members time to look over his resume and that of others. In the vote to table Rose's appointment, Bradley was again the only "no" vote. His appointment will be considered again Tuesday night.

Stein said anyone in the township may apply for membership in any of five committees (which also includes studies of the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC), sign and term ordinances and industrial and commercial development). In the areas of police and land use, Stein said he is looking for people with related work experience.

"We are accepting resumes for all of the committees and if you are unable to type your qualifications, you may call my secretary who will take down the information over the telephone," Stein said.

Tom Quinn, head of the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), which will be the subject of one of the five study groups, asked Stein what qualifications he was looking for in people to sit on the land use study group.

Stein said he'd like to see people with experience in civil engineering, urban planning and "maybe a larger representation is in fact necessary for the farmers who live on the west side of Canton Center Road."

"We need their input," Stein said, "and we never had it all the time we were discussing plans about keeping agricultural land in the western half. I've spoken to some of these people and they said they were afraid to come forth before and are now willing."

Republican candidate for supervisor, Peter Bundarin, repeated his contention that the committees need informed experts and not just random citizen opinion. He added that people who wished to contribute information to the committees could do so without being an official member.

About "five to ten" official members will make up each of the committees, according to Stein.

MEMBERS OF the audience asked the board what the specific issues of each study group would be.

After disagreement among board members on the point, Stein said "specific

Ice rinks are scarce in Canton

Ice, ice, everywhere, but not a spot to skate on.

That appears to be the plight of ice skaters this month in Canton Township who have been forced to go out of town to skate.

Canton Township recreation department sponsored two rinks last year, one behind the department of public works building and the other at the Canton Recreation Field.

The spot behind the D.P.W. yard has been converted into a parking lot, and the recreation field has not been flooded because of thawing problems last year, according to Brenda Pollock, head of the recreation department.

"We do provide a \$55 service to flood an area for a skating rink," said Ms. Pollock. "People are starting to call, but so far there's nothing open to the general public that I know of."

Judy Kohle of the Willow Creek Home Owners Association said she inquired about setting up an ice rink at the subdivision park but decided against it after learning that liability insurance would run \$600 for the season.

In past years there have been ice rinks along the Rouge flats, but nothing has materialized yet in Canton.

Many Canton people could be found indoors at the Plymouth Ice Arena last week. Many of them lamented the fact that nothing existed in Canton.

There has been some movement in the Pickwick Subdivision towards building an ice rink in their park, but as of Dec. 7, nothing had transpired. Even if built, subdivision park rinks would only be open to the residents of each subdivision, according to spokespersons for various home owner associations.

Free money for qualifiers

Building grants offered to low-income

If you're a Canton resident in a low-income bracket and need extra money to remedy a building violation in your home, township officials want to know who and where you are.

Canton's Deputy Treasurer Mike Gorman is preparing Canton's application for a 1977 federal housing rehabilitation grant, and he has to know where the need for the federal money lies.

Under federal guidelines governing the grant program, local officials must designate certain sections of their municipalities as target areas of the grant program in their application forms.

Gorman says he must submit Canton's application by Dec. 15.

The deputy treasurer urges all low-income residents who could use maximum \$4,000 housing rehabilitation grant to contact him at township hall.

Township officials will use the 1977 federal grant money to help residents bring their home up to code and remedy such building violations as plumbing, electrical wiring and heating deficiencies. Large families with inadequate space in

their homes may obtain grants to construct an addition.

Under guidelines of the township program, the grants are outright gifts to low-income Canton residents, if they live in their homes for three or more years after the money is spent. Residents must repay the township the amount of the grant if they fail to meet the residency requirement.

ACCORDING TO Gorman, a representative of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), administrator of the program, has already promised Canton a minimum \$25,000 housing grant during the 1977 fiscal year because of the township's participation in the 1976 program.

Canton officials received \$22,000 this year in federal housing monies. Funds have already been granted to five low-income residents of this year's target areas—McIntyre Manor and Dye Brothers Subdivision—to remedy building violations in their homes or construct a needed addition.

But Canton officials hope to receive far more money this year. According to Gorman, \$150,000 in federal rehabilitation funds are up for grabs in Wayne County this year, with Canton and 11 other communities competing for a large chunk of the pie. Canton was the only nearby municipality which established an outright grant program with its funds this year. Other communities established low-interest loan programs.

Gorman says the amount of funds communities receive in 1977 depend on the success of their 1976 program. The deputy treasurer called Canton's 1976 program "a whopping success."

"But we did have some problems," he admitted. "Some people were a little leery of anyone giving them anything for nothing. The granddaughter of one woman who received a grant said her grandmother was afraid to apply, because she thought we'd take her home away from her."

In sharp contrast to Canton's successful grant program is the City of Plymouth's low-interest loan plan. So far, no one has

applied for the city's housing rehabilitation money.

CANTON OFFICIALS, on the other hand, have granted \$4,000 to one family to construct a needed addition; \$1,400 to another family for a new furnace; \$2,000 to a third family for a furnace; \$2,000 to another resident for electrical work; \$2,000 for a new roof and construction of a basement bedroom; \$4,000 for a new septic field; and \$600 for new windows.

The remaining portion of the \$22,000 grant, Gorman said, was used to finance the first-year administrative costs of establishing the program.

Under guidelines of the township's grant program, a three-person committee screens residents' application forms and verifies the applicants' incomes to determine eligibility under federal low-income requirements.

A family is determined low-income under those requirements if its liquid assets are assessed at \$10,000 or less and its gross income equals:

- A maximum \$7,650 for one person.
- \$8,775 for two persons.
- \$9,825 for three persons.
- \$10,950 for four persons.
- \$11,625 for five persons.
- \$12,300 for six persons.
- \$12,975 for seven persons.
- \$13,725 for eight persons.

After the committee members determine financial eligibility, Canton building inspector Charlie Thompson inspects the family's home and estimates cost of the work needed to bring the home up to code.

Township officials recommend two or three contractors to grant recipients, after officials advertise for bids to identify contractors with the lowest fees. Checks for the grants are made to the homeowner.

Gorman said several residents who live outside the target areas of this year's grant program inquired about the 1976 grant money. The deputy treasurer said he will try to include those residents' neighborhoods on the township's 1977 application forms.

Teachers wish to deter negativism

A newly-formed steering committee for the teachers union has cautioned the Plymouth Board of Education against unnecessarily creating negative attitudes in the community.

In a letter to the school board the steering committee stated, in part: "We know it is fashionable to scoff and deride and minimize extra time and effort put forth without recompense."

"But you must realize that these are the very real factors which contribute to a healthy, thriving school system, one which can be publicized legitimately and proudly."

"We are very much concerned that the current negotiations posture you have adopted will yield some rather negative results and attitudes which will prove far more costly to this community for an indefinite period of time than the relatively few dollars you are withholding which could produce a fair settlement."

THE PEA, union for teachers, created the steering committee under the co-chairmanship of PEA past presidents—John Ryder and Bill Grimmer.

Purpose of the committee is to serve in an "advisory capacity" to the PEA negotiating team for the duration of the period when teachers are working without a contract.

Ryder and Grimmer explain that the steering committee is broadly represented by staff members from all buildings and by most facets of the professional staff. They indicate the Nov. 30 letter to the school board is the first in a series of communications to the board in hopes that a contract can be negotiated.

FOR MANY YEARS, the committee points out, business and government leaders have touted Plymouth as "the city of homes, a fine place to settle and raise your kids in a wonderful school system."

"Well, teachers live in this town also and they live in homes which are taxed to help the wonderful school system survive and flourish. Please consider the ludicrous situation in which many of us find ourselves: we have not by any stretch of the imagination kept pace with the cost of liv-

ing. We supported the millage increase which added to our tax burden, like that of other citizens; yet, partially because of this, we are going to wind up further behind than ever.

"In addition to this situation, you are expecting us to continue to act the part of dedicated public servants and to give of our time and effort beyond the basic call of duty. Please consider how absurd it is, for example, to continue to expect certain people who historically have been paid for working on Saturdays and evenings and on an extended school day to continue to do this without pay. Yet this is what you are maintaining in your current stance."

THE BOARD was asked not to regard as inconsequential what is now occurring in the school district.

"The gradual erosion of a positive teaching atmosphere, the comprehensive lessening of a willingness to participate in activities such as the Curriculum Coordinating Committee, millage campaigns, etc., the pervasive and debilitating apathy, and the growing feelings that doing a good job is not only unappreciated but unnecessary."

"These conditions are only made more pronounced when teachers feel that their desires and concerns are distorted and devalued through such sources as the recent editorial where educators are perceived as interested solely in 'yummy salary increases.' Half-witted, banal, and contemptible remarks such as these only lend support to the feeling that we should do just the absolute minimum and let the politicians fight it out. Meanwhile, the district goes to hell."

"We are, therefore, asking you to consider seriously the inevitable outcomes of your continuing the present course of negotiations. We are asking this not as some servile gesture of pleading for more money. We work in this town. We want to provide a healthy and worthwhile contribution to the life processes of this town. We are looking to you to provide the conditions and atmosphere for this to take place."

Consumer bill backed on final vote

Except for three absentees, area legislators all backed SB 1—the so-called "Consumer Protection Act"—when it passed both houses of the Michigan Legislature last week.

A conference report was adopted by both houses after house committee members backed off two pet ideas—giving the attorney general authority to add new illegal practices to the list spelled out in the bill, and writing in antitrust provisions banning unfair competitive practices.

The senate gave it 29-3 passage. Supporting it were Sens. Donald Bishop (R-Rochester), Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park), William Faust (D-Westland) and Bill Huffman (D-Madison Heights). Missing was 2d District Congressman-elect Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth).

The house vote was 70-14. Reps. William Keith (D-Garden City) and Richard Fessler (R-Union Lake) were absent.

THE NEW LAW takes effect April 1. It defines deceptive trade practices as those which mislead a prospective buyer.

For example, a store violates the law if it advertises a "special" and then stocks only a small quantity of the item.

A real estate salesperson and a car dealer who know about defects in their products and fail to inform the buyer would also be in violation.

Altogether, 29 practices are outlawed. Consumers, as well as county prosecutors and the state attorney general, may take alleged violators to court. A consumer may file a case himself in small claims court, hire an attorney (whose fees must be paid by the seller if the consumer wins) or take his complaint to the attorney general or county prosecutor.

If the consumer can prove wrongdoing, the law provides for a minimum \$250 in damages, even if the harm to the consumer is much less.

"We have carried almost everything from pregnant Holstein heifers going to Iran to increase their milk supply to auto parts and fresh strawberries from California," Mills said.

Education can't start too early for impaired

A yellow burlap sign hangs from the ceiling of Farrand Elementary School's north-west wing.

"Infant and Preschool Special Education Program" the sign shouts in bold black letters.

Beyond are classrooms equipped with play pens, cribs and toddler toys, where preschoolers and even babies under one year old play and chatter each week.

The classrooms in the special education wing of the Plymouth elementary school are devoted to the education of children, ages one day to five years old, whose lives are complicated by mental, physical or emotional handicaps.

DESIGNED TO SERVE handicapped preschoolers and their parents who live in the Plymouth, Livonia, Redford Union, South Redford, Garden City, Northville and Cherry Hill school districts, the program marks a sharp contrast to treatment given to handicapped preschoolers just a few years ago.

Before the Michigan Mandatory Special Education Act became effective in 1973,

handicapped preschoolers were offered no special education opportunities.

As a result, says Mary Nutter, supervisor of the preschool program housed in Farrand, parents of many handicapped children were unable to give the special attention required for their child's development.

A parent of a child who cannot walk, for example, should continually bring the toys and materials needed for mental stimulation to the child, Mrs. Nutter explained. If the parent doesn't, secondary learning disabilities, caused as a side effect of the original handicap, could set in and damage the child's future learning potential.

But because of the Michigan Mandatory Special Education Act, dangers of harmful side effects are considerably eased. The law requires local school districts to offer special education opportunities to all handicapped youngsters from the day they are born to their 25th birthday.

"THE PURPOSE of this program is to provide instruction to parents to enable them to work better with the child," Mrs. Nutter explained. "We work through the parent to the child. By getting the child early, we hopefully can prepare him for

school and change his future outlook."

Children enrolled in the Farrand program range in age from 10 months to five years old. Most suffer from physical handicaps or speech impediments, and a few are mentally impaired.

The 36 children currently enrolled in the program are divided into two groups. Fourteen preschoolers and their parents come to Farrand's special education wing one or two mornings each week to receive individualized instruction and evaluation.

The remaining 22 children are enrolled in the center's home study program. A teacher travels to the child's home one day each week and shows the parent how to best deal with the child's handicap and offer him the stimulation he needs.

In addition, program staffers discuss the children's handicaps. Staff members tell parents of the special equipment, such as wheelchairs or crutches that their children

need as well as the toys that will stimulate the preschoolers' imaginations.

Information on specific handicaps and the possible physical side effects the handicap could produce are available in the center's library. Parents may check out toys, arranged in the center's library according to the physical, visual or mental skills they are designed to evoke.

"The program gives parents a chance to talk about and share their common problems," Mrs. Nutter explained. "What's it like to have a physically impaired baby? A doctor often diagnoses the problem, tells the parents and leaves. We show the parent how to deal with the problem."

Mrs. Nutter calls the program "cross-categorical" because it offers educational opportunities to children with a variety of physical, mental and emotional handicaps.

The program's 14-member staff includes

a psychologist, a nurse, a speech pathologist, a media specialist and an occupational therapist as well as certified special education teachers.

"We believe you shouldn't stereotype kids by their condition," Mrs. Nutter explained. "The kids who are physically impaired can learn from the kids who are mentally impaired and vice versa."

The seven western Wayne County school districts involved in the program decided to pool their preschool special education efforts this year, Mrs. Nutter said, after receiving state, county and federal funds to establish the program.

Plymouth School District officials volunteered to house the program in Farrand Elementary School. Livonia offers a multi-district program for visually-impaired preschoolers, while the Redford Union School District offers a program for the hearing impaired.

So far, the majority of children enrolled in Plymouth's cross-categorical program live in the Plymouth School District, Mrs. Nutter said. Few children come from Garden City because that district offers its own program for handicapped preschoolers.

Parents of handicapped preschoolers are urged to call the special education director in their own school district, Mrs. Nutter said.

Parents may be referred to staff members of the Plymouth program, who will evaluate their child and submit a recommendation on an educational program. Parents are free to accept or reject the recommendation.

"The important thing of this program," Mrs. Nutter said, "is that it involves the parent and the child. The more parents understand their child's problem, the better they'll be able to prepare for that child's future."

PEA package prompts board

The Plymouth teachers bargaining team laid a comprehensive package on the table Friday afternoon in hopes of beginning more intensive negotiations on all issues instead of concentrating on differences over salary.

Although an immediate settlement isn't in sight, it was the first move by either side at the bargaining table in more than a month.

After offering the comprehensive package offer, the PEA called for a general membership meeting today (Monday) in the Penn Theatre to update teachers on bargaining status and to explain terms of the package offer.

CANDI REECE, PEA president, explained Friday afternoon why the package approach was used.

"By putting all the unresolved issues together on the table, it's easier to look at so we aren't dealing with salary alone. There may be some areas the PEA would be willing to change its position in hopes of settling differences in other areas."

"So far, we've spent a lot of time talking about salary—an area where agreement doesn't exist. Hopefully, some meaningful negotiations can be held in other areas such as the calendar, contract riders, and other issues."

Both sides met from 1 p.m. to about 3:30 p.m. Friday. After examining the PEA package, the school board negotiators have agreed to generate a comprehensive package of their own to bring back to the table this Friday.

NORMAN KEE, chief negotiator for the school board, said the package included items which the PEA sees as being unresolved, but didn't include some items the board is asking for which are unresolved.

"We will counter with a similar comprehensive package," Kee said, "and will address what the PEA sees as unresolved issues and include some of our unresolved items."

Kee described the PEA's package as "more like a reiteration" of previous offers. "There was a slight movement downwards in their salary offer, but there was new proposals in other areas of the contract that will cost more money if accepted. Based on our early analysis, it appears like the downward movement of the PEA on salary is overcome by economic increases in other sections of the unresolved issues, primarily those dealing with contract riders."

Mrs. Reece agreed the latest difficulty, beyond salary, is on contract riders. "The PEA didn't really make a new offer on contract riders. This is an area where we haven't been able to reach agreement, and so we suggested a couple options which might be solutions. Now the board can come back with any options they might have which could provide a solution."

"The PEA didn't make any higher, counter offers but just suggested a couple options to be explored. Maybe there was a misinterpretation."

Kee said he was pleased to see some movement at the table, but realistically didn't see anything revealing in the package offer that would suggest a settlement being reached soon.

Mrs. Reece added that the package offer was an attempt to break the current impasse.

pass in bargaining. "If it has, then we've made progress."

Kee added that Friday's package offer was the first time the PEA has countered the board's last offer made on Oct. 19. "We made the offer Oct. 19 and never received a counter offer at the table; now we've one."

MEANWHILE, the Michigan Employment Relations Commission (MERC) is proceeding with hearings on an unfair labor practice charge filed against the school board by the PEA.

Last Wednesday the first hearing was held and the PEA presented its arguments on why the board negotiators committed an unfair labor practice. The second hearing has been scheduled for Dec. 15 to allow the board and its attorney to respond to the PEA allegations.

The PEA has charged Kee committed an unfair labor practice in October when he made a new offer, got the PEA to counter and then withdrew it. Kee says there was a misunderstanding about the new offer and he had simply issued a clarification to make certain the PEA understood the offer. After the clarification was given, the PEA withdrew its counter-offer and didn't offer a counter until last Friday.

Under MERC guidelines, the PEA has the burden to prove that the board team committed an unfair labor practice.

State investigating Knollwood cemetery

Representatives of a cemetery in Canton have been ordered by the state to appear at a formal hearing in Lansing today to respond to alleged shortages in trust funds.

Appearing before the Michigan Cemetery Commission will be representatives of the Knollwood Memorial Park Association which is located at 1299 Ridge Road, south of Ford Road on the west side of Ridge in Canton Township.

The commission, part of the Michigan Department of Commerce, has ordered Knollwood and Dawn Memorial Estates Cemetery of Lapeer to appear at its offices.

The cemeteries could be shut down if no satisfactory repayment program is offered. Cemeteries are required by law to maintain trust funds which are used in the sale of crypts, mausoleums and gravesites. The owner this week says changes will be made to satisfy the desires of the commission.

The cemetery commission conducted an audit of Knollwood's trust fund earlier this year. Deposits must be made to the trust funds upon sales of burial rights, burial vaults, grave memorials, or other cemetery merchandise.

The state audit showed the total deficit at Knollwood was \$70,030 and \$20,415 at Dawn Memorial.

JCs discuss apartheid and world convention

The World Congress of Jaycees has decided to hold its 1977 meeting in South Africa, a country which has come under much censure for its racial policy of apartheid. A sampling of local members of the civic group indicated there is not much concern over the decision to hold its convention in a country which practices segregation and economic discrimination.

"It doesn't bother me," stated Scott Dodge, a Plymouth attorney. "People could go there and try to influence the way they think."

Phil Soper, current president of the Plymouth Jaycees, feels the same way. "I see no problem with it," he remarked. "These kinds of meetings are open for anyone to bid on. Countries all over the world can make their offer."

"The Jaycees is a young man's group, and there is nothing better for a young man than to view how other people live. But I would say that the Jaycees should not get politically involved."

Community Programming Vice-President Wendell Sikes said that he wasn't in-

GARY EPPOLITO, owner of Knollwood, told the Observer that he sent a letter to the cemetery commission Tuesday which he hopes will clear up the matter.

"The questions of the state dealt primarily with the equipment trust. Under state law, if we sell a vault, for instance, 70 per cent of the price must be placed in a trust to insure future delivery, so half of our profits are tied up in that trust."

"What happened is that last year, in lieu of cash, we invested \$150,000 in property and placed it in the trust. Thus, we had a 2-1 equity in the trust fund but the state wanted cash equity and not real estate."

"I have promised to George Bruce of the cemetery commission that within 30 days we will liquidate our real estate equity and put cash back into the trusts."

He added that laws have been changing on cemetery requirements, the most recent being in April 1975. "The commission, of course, only regulates commercial cemeteries and Knollwood has been the only one started since 1969."

Knollwood was incorporated in 1968 and started developing the next year. Eppolito added that he has recently acquired an additional 20 acres to have frontage on Ford Road so the cemetery now totals 100 acres.

"I'm sure the questions of the state will be cleared up promptly. It's a matter of interpretation and we will make whatever changes the state desires."

point where the sheriffs now will run Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) checks at the request of Canton officers. Direct radio communication with the sheriffs in all cars is being explored right now, said Stein. Canton has applied for LEIN machine clearance on its own but that application has reportedly been held in abeyance until the department is more established.

Interim Police Chief Carl Silvers walked up to the lectern Monday night to answer questions from the board and audience. Gerald Neizgoda, a Canton police reserve, wanted to know who ordered the patrol car removed and asked who ordered Canton certified officers to take a low profile during a recent fight inside the Red Door bar on Michigan Ave.

Silvers explained that he ordered his officers to wait outside until "more expe-

rienced" officers from the Wayne County Sheriff arrived. It was at Stein's order that the fourth patrol car was taken off, Silvers said. Thom Carman and Jim Donahue, leaders of the recent write-in campaign drive, both said they objected to the police cut-back and suggested that surplus monies in the general budget be spent to beef up police protection. Their comments were echoed by a group of people who supported Robert Greenstein in the recent election. Carman said he felt the police chief's "low profile" directive at the recent bar fight hurt "the p.r. image" of Canton's police. "We know there's been a written directive treating them (Canton police) as if they're not certified officers," Carman said. "It's as if a person goes through medical

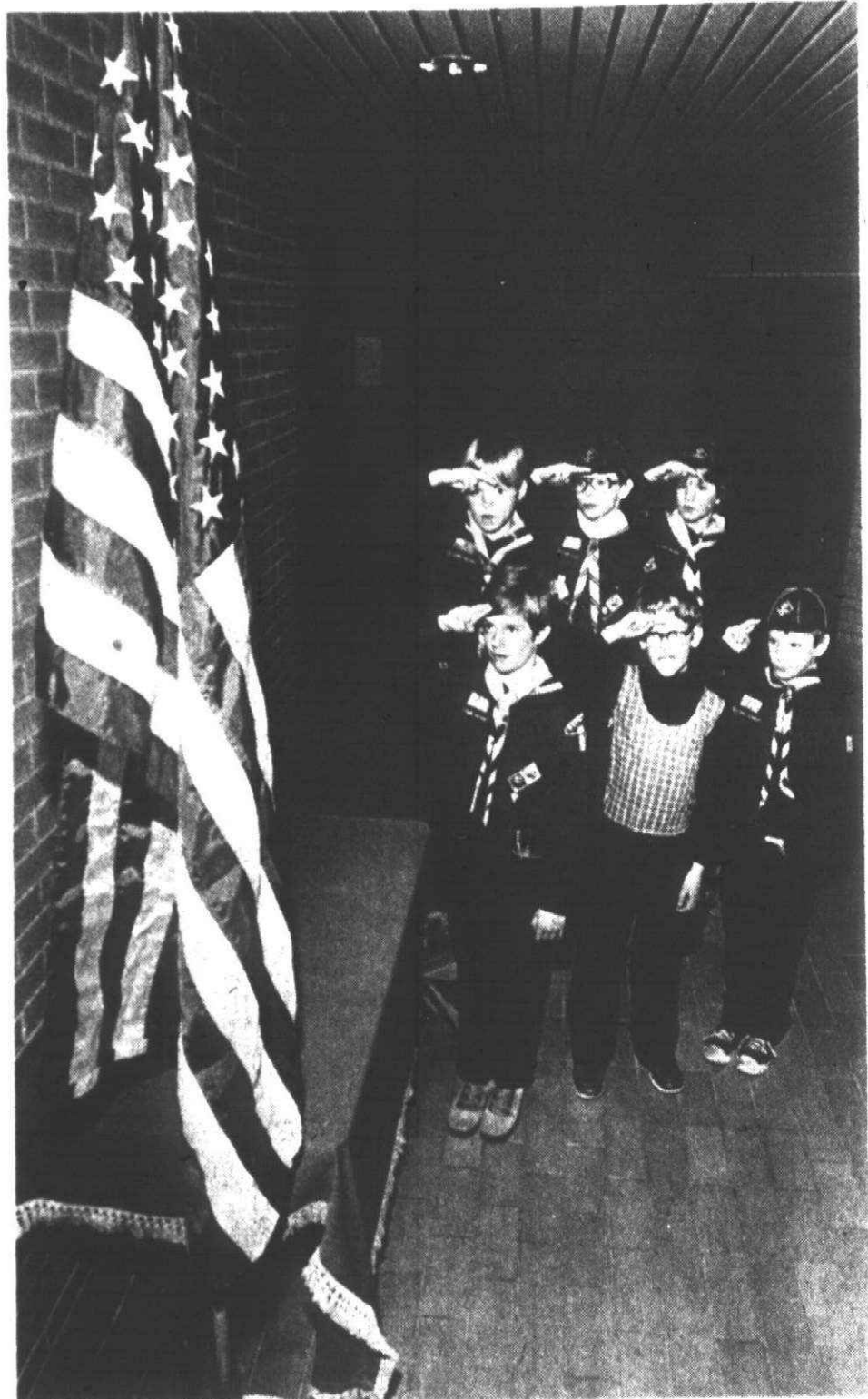
school and then won't be able to practice medicine," Carman said. "It doesn't make a lot of sense." Silvers said Monday night that he believed the order was correct. "Just because a man is certified doesn't mean he's experienced," said Silvers. "You don't send Christians into the lion's den. It's best to get experienced officers there." 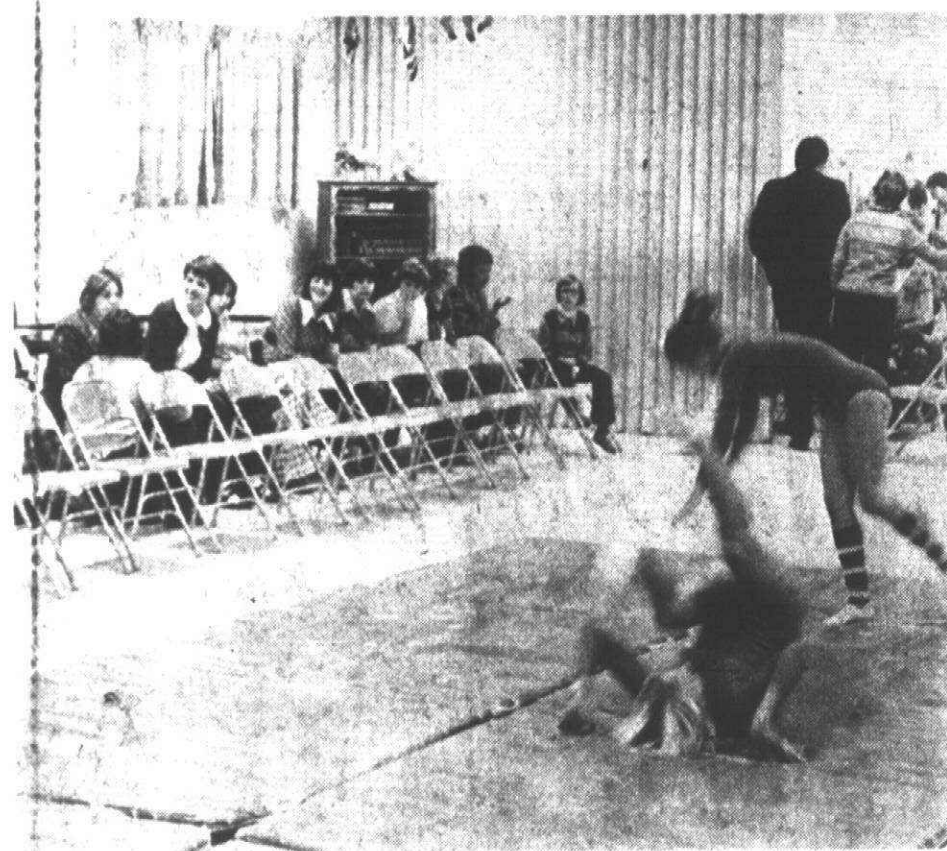

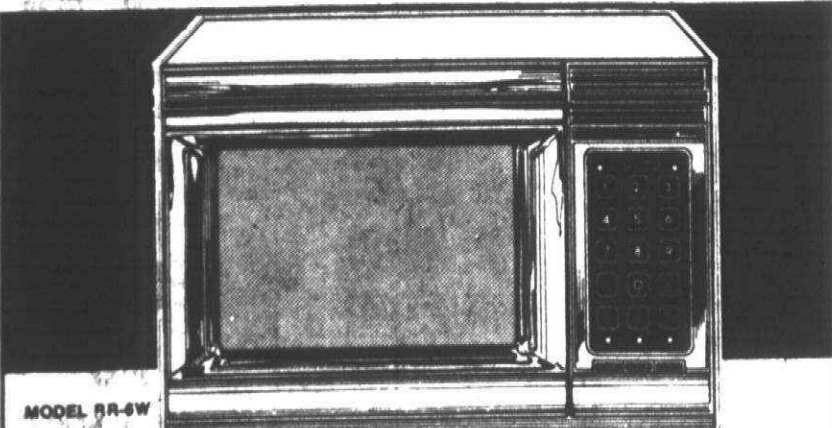

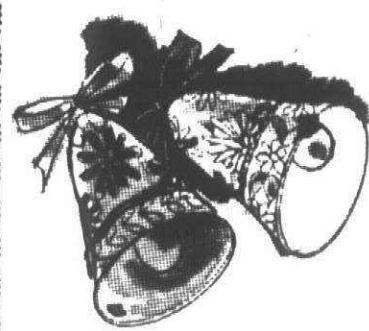

If your doctor fits the positive points above, chances are you have a good physician.

Pursell replacements surfacing

There is at least one new face in the running for a soon-to-be vacated state senate seat in the 14th District.

The post is now held by Carl Pursell, Plymouth Republican, who is expecting to be the next congressman from the 2d District. But his Nov. 2 Democratic opponent, Ed Pierce of Ann Arbor, is challenging the 344-vote margin of defeat, and Pursell can't resign his senate seat until the election results are confirmed or accepted by the U.S. House of Representatives.

In the meantime, Republicans and Democrats in the senate district which includes Plymouth, Livonia and Redford Township are gearing up for a special primary and general election next spring.

ON THE DEMOCRATIC side, two candidates are still in the race—City Councilman Jerry Raymond of Livonia and Paul Kadish, also of Livonia who is president of the Schoolcraft College board of trustees.

Another candidate expected to announce his intentions soon is Supervisor Patrick McDonald of Redford Township who recently won the recommended endorsement of the United Auto Workers' community action program (CAP) screening committee.

McDonald has refused to say whether he is a candidate, but said he will discuss the election and his activities in it later this week.

One name that has been dropped from possible consideration is State Rep. John Markes, who said earlier that he was thinking about the senate race. He added that he was considering attending the UAW-CAP screening meeting for a possible endorsement but decided not to attend.

Markes, a state representative for four years, was defeated by Republican Robert Law of Livonia last month.

Markes said this week that he has accepted a post as legislative representative in Lansing for Detroit Edison Co., a firm which he had worked for 25 years before taking a leave of absence when first elected to the state house in late 1972.

Markes said that his new job will require him to register as a lobbyist. He added that he will also move to Lansing to assume the new job, which starts in early January.

Markes was in an electrical engineering position for Edison for many years.

KADISH INSISTED that he is "still in the race for the time being" and added that "If I can win, I'm in the race. I've got more manpower than anyone else."

He said that if he, Raymond and McDonald all run for the Democratic nomination, "I'll be the first to admit that McDonald could sneak in—I'm not anxious to see that happen."

Kadish, who was the senate nominee in 1970 when Pursell won his first term, said that McDonald is nothing but a "name candidate." There was another McDonald—Jack—who was a Redford supervisor and congressman whose district included Livonia until the 1972 reapportionment.

ON THE REPUBLICAN side of the campaign, no one has announced, but State Rep. Robert Geake of Northville and Wayne County Commissioner Mary Dumas have been telling persons they will run for the senate nomination.

Both have been in their current positions for four years and won re-election to third terms by 2-1 margins last month.

Both Republicans also served on the Schoolcraft College board before winning their current elective posts.

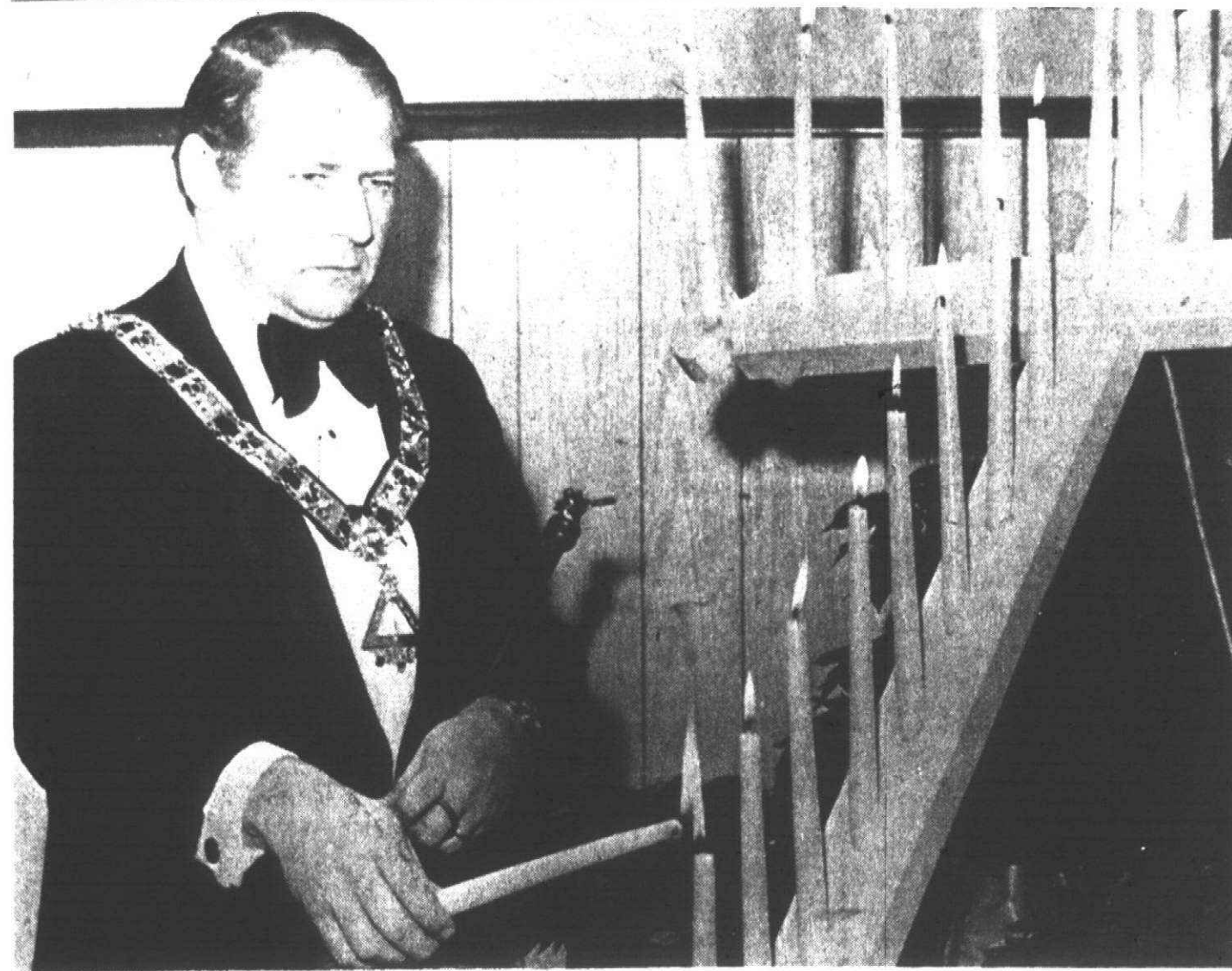

2 commissioners challenge validity of housing claims

Two city commissioners remain unconvinced that there were 157 residents from the City of Plymouth who had applied to

live in the apartments for senior citizens proposed by Forest City-Dillon. After receiving the report Monday night,

commissioners Jack Moehle and Beverly McAninch who both challenged the verification process used.

City Clerk Paul Brumfield and Police Chief Tim Ford had inspected the applications made to Forest City-Dillon, counted the number of applicants from the city, those from other communities, and those from other communities who had relatives in the city.

The two administrators reported that 157 applicants were from the city, 111 from Plymouth Township, 34 from Canton, and 40 whose next-of-kin lived in the City of Plymouth.

MOEHLE COMMENTED that the report was not what the city commission had asked for by resolution at the previous meeting.

That motion asked the mayor to appoint the city clerk and another city administrator "to review the applications of Forest City-Dillon to verify the number and validity of applicants from the City of Plymouth and report their findings at the next meeting on Dec. 6."

The disagreement Monday night was on the meaning of the phrase "to verify the number and validity of applicants." Moehle and McAninch argued that the audit only counted numerically those who applied and claimed to be residents, but didn't confirm that the applicants actually resided at the addresses claimed.

"I'm sure Paul and Tim did exactly what they were told to do," said Moehle, "but the instructions they were given is not the same as what we asked for in the resolution. The validation of applicants hasn't been accomplished. But there's no point in pursuing this any further."

Mayor Joe Bida and Commissioner Norbert Battermann then asked exactly what had been desired in the way of validation. "I thought the validation you wanted was whether the applicants were residents of the city and their addresses," Battermann said.

Moehle asked whether any phone calls were made to verify that people who claimed to live at a particular address actually did.

Ford said no personal contacts were made. "Some of the applicants were personally known by Paul and myself, but no phone contacts were made. Our job, as I understood it, was to verify if applicants did or did not list the city as their place of residence."

Jack Wilcox, who owns the property Forest City-Dillon had selected for a site, said he was present when many residents had applied. "They were very desirous of living in the building and would have given the correct address because they expected to be contacted later on whether they were to be accepted as occupants."

MRS. McANINCH then referred to a proposed project by Forest City-Dillon in Ypsilanti.

"When a spot check verification was made in Ypsilanti a sizeable percentage of the applicants weren't residents at the addresses given. The Ypsilanti councilman who talked to me said the names were given only to be added to a list to make it look good."

"This report doesn't mean that all 157 are verified as city residents. We took it on faith at the last meeting that verified meant verified. There wasn't an attempt to even spot check 10 or so. This report counted names on the list but still isn't verified data," Mrs. McAninch added.

Responding to a question from City Manager Fred Yockey, Chief Ford commented: "From my knowledge this was a bona fide list of applicants. There are a number of addresses I'm personally unfamiliar with. In a number of instances—more than a dozen—we checked a cross-index to confirm city residence."

A motion made by Battermann, supported by McAninch, to receive the report and thank Ford and Brumfield for their efforts was approved 6-0 with Tom Turner absent.

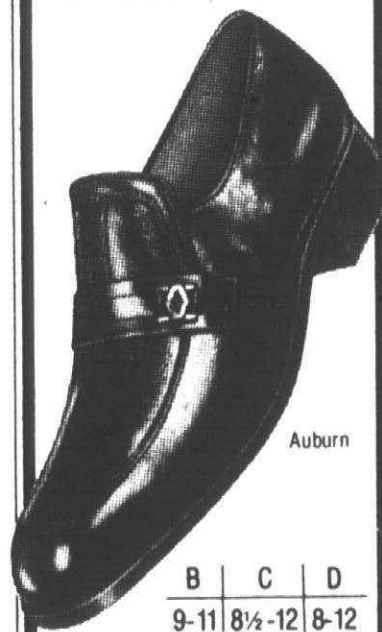

A few years ago, it was prophesized that the new wave in the future of communications was cable television (CATV). Companies were formed, cities granted franchise requests, and we waited, and waited, and waited. And the day never arrived.

Instead, cable TV is used in remote areas—such as Michigan's Upper Peninsula—in motels to draw in channels because reception is too bad for on-the-roof antennas to do the job.

Now the communication prophets talk in terms of 1990 or the year 2000 before CATV comes into its own. The main advantage of cable TV is you can pipe in a number of channels into one home and thus increase the variety of programming. In part, the demand has been lessened by the excellent job public television is doing in putting something on the tube other than soap operas, game shows, adventure series, situation comedies and Monday Night Football.

But that is not to say there is no need for cable television. The potential and possibilities are still great enough that there would be many subscribers if there were any corporation willing to take the risk. Cable television has been introduced in Chi-

cago and its suburbs, and other metropolitan areas, with moderate success. But nothing, yet, in the greater Detroit area.

MY OWN GUESS is that CATV will be introduced in this area for the same reason it has in the Upper Peninsula—to get adequate reception.

This may sound strange because most of us now can get channels 2, 4, 7, 9 and acceptable images on Toledo stations 11 and 13, plus public television 20, 50, 56, and 62. But that reception ability is being challenged.

What I'm referring to is the citizen's band (CB) popularity boom which has reached the point where there are some five million sets in operation nationwide. The first thing the CBER does is get equipment for the automobile, and then he buys equipment for a home base (inside the house).

When the home base is installed, the CBER, to get good reception over a longer distance, will then install an antenna on the top of his roof. Now the equipment is such that a CB home base should not interfere with your home television set. The antennas are different, the signals are on a different frequency, and the two should never meet. But, somehow, they do. Even though it's not supposed to happen, I still get CBERs chatting with each other on my set—interrupting the dialogue of "Mary Hartman, Mary Hartman."

As the CB antennas sprout up in my neighborhood, there also is an increase in picture interference on my screen. I will again admit that there should be no correlation and that the interference must be caused by something else—like airplanes, high power electrical lines, or my neighbor's egg beater. But if sounds which aren't supposed to come over my set do, I'm inclined to believe that the inter-

ference is coming from CB signals, even though it shouldn't.

SOME OPERATORS have illegal equipment which they use to increase the range over which they can broadcast. But being illegal doesn't mean that much.

As more and more people purchase CB equipment, the problem of enforcing regulations becomes almost impossible.

The next problem is that some CB fans may decide to advance a step and become ham operators. And have you ever seen the antennas used by ham operators. I've got one on my block that's large enough that it could be used to hang the laundry for every household within a square-mile radius.

And, once again, I have been told, and have every reason to accept as truth, the fact that the operation of ham radio sets won't cause any interference for reception of television images and sound. But as the CB and ham radio antennas pop up on roofs in my neighborhood, all of a sudden I'm getting interference and strange voices on my TV set.

I'm not writing this to get angry calls from CB fans or ham operators. Before calling, I will go on record as being ignorant of CB and ham equipment and all the protection devices they include. All I know is what I see and hear on my own TV.

The point is, though, that the best way to get rid of CB and ham radio interference (which we all know doesn't really exist, right?) is to eliminate roof antennas for televisions and pipe in the signals into the set by underground cable.

Thus cable television will come into existence here not by the primary demand for variety in programming but to gain proper reception. That seems like a much more sensible approach than to attempt to police five million CB users to make sure they aren't using amplifiers.

New schools to be dedicated

Mildred Field Elementary School at 1000 S. Haggerty will have its dedication program at 3 p.m. Miss Field is traveling from her present residence in South Haven to participate.

Ruth Eriksson Holcomb retired in 1971 after 43 years in education. She came to Plymouth in 1939 to teach sixth grade at Central Elementary where she remained for 11 years. When the Smith Elementary opened in 1950, Miss Eriksson became its

first principal—a position she held for 21 years.

Mildred Field had devoted 45 years to education before retiring in 1972. For 19 years she was principal of Starkweather Elementary in Plymouth, after a broad range of experience in teaching. Besides her achievements in education, she was active in the First United Methodist Church, Business and Professional Women, Sororists, and the YMCA.

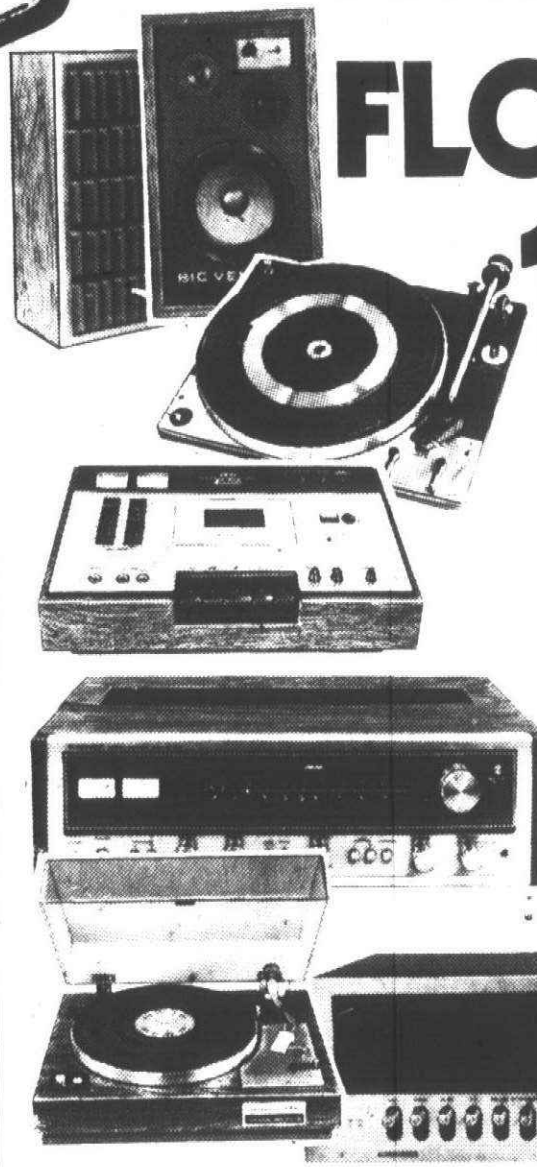

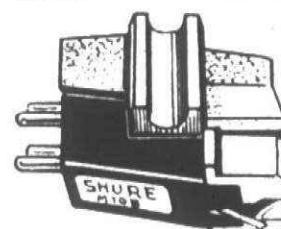

Driving along the snow-covered highways is one of the last places you would expect a fellow to suffer pangs of nostalgia. But that is exactly what happened to The Stroller.

As he drove through a light flurry of snow he got to thinking of the days back home in the foothills in Pennsylvania when the snow covered ground meant only one thing—get out the sleighs and sleds and head for the Pine Street Hill.

With these thoughts, he also got to wondering if the young folks of today had the same urge to go "belly-bumper" down any of the hills or to be a passenger on the homemade bobsleds that were the envy of every young lad and lassie.

Strangely, as he looked about, there were no signs of bobsledding, not even on the big mound in Hines Park, and there were no signs of any youngsters getting out their flexible flyers and heading for the hill.

The first thought that struck The Stroller was that this is mainly flat country. There

are few, if any, hills for the young folks to try to master.

BUT EVEN in Northville, where the rolling country is much like the hills back home, there wasn't a single youngster with a sled to be found.

As he drove, mile after mile, The Stroller again envisioned the hills back home and the great times that were had when the snow on the ground warranted bobsledding.

Now our town was a small place—so small that the only hill cut right through the main intersection of the business area and ended at the entrance to a bridge over to the railroad station.

Dangerous as it was, though, the hill was a great attraction and even the elders took time to enjoy on one or two trips down the hill in the course of an evening.

The hill was even more dangerous because the intersection on Main Street also was the main right-of-way for the old-time trolley cars. But this meant little to the

young folks who defied the danger and went scooting over the trolley tracks and far up on the bridge approach.

It was quite a treat for those who owned their own flexible flyers. They'd take a few steps on the run then let the flyer go to the ground and fall on it for the ride down the hill. Those were aptly called "belly-bumper" rides.

If a fellow chanced to possess his own flyer, he guarded it with his life. Once he got accustomed to it he would even challenge others to beat him down the hill.

CAME ONE summer, though, when The Stroller was invited over to a neighbor's woodshed. It was a rather large place at the end of the yard and it held a surprise, the hopes of a young builder.

He was constructing a bobsled that would carry at least 12 passengers. This wasn't an ordinary bobsled, this one had a steering wheel much like the automobiles of the day.

In confidence, he asked The Stroller to

help; after much to-do, we finally got it finished before the first good snow fall.

All eyes were centered on our work when we finally brought the big sled to the hill and invited the lads and lassies to hop aboard. There was only one thing wrong—the sled was slung so low that you had to hold up the legs of the passenger sitting behind you.

That was of little consequence, however, and soon we were off on the maiden trip—and disaster.

About half way down the hill something went wrong. What it was no one knows to this day. But the bobsled sort of jack-knifed, veered to the side of the hill and dumped all of its passengers into the snow banks.

It was a great ride up to that moment. It is only a memory now, but somehow, The Stroller, feels the youngsters of today are missing a lot of fun by not taking advantage of the snow and finding a place to go belly bumper.

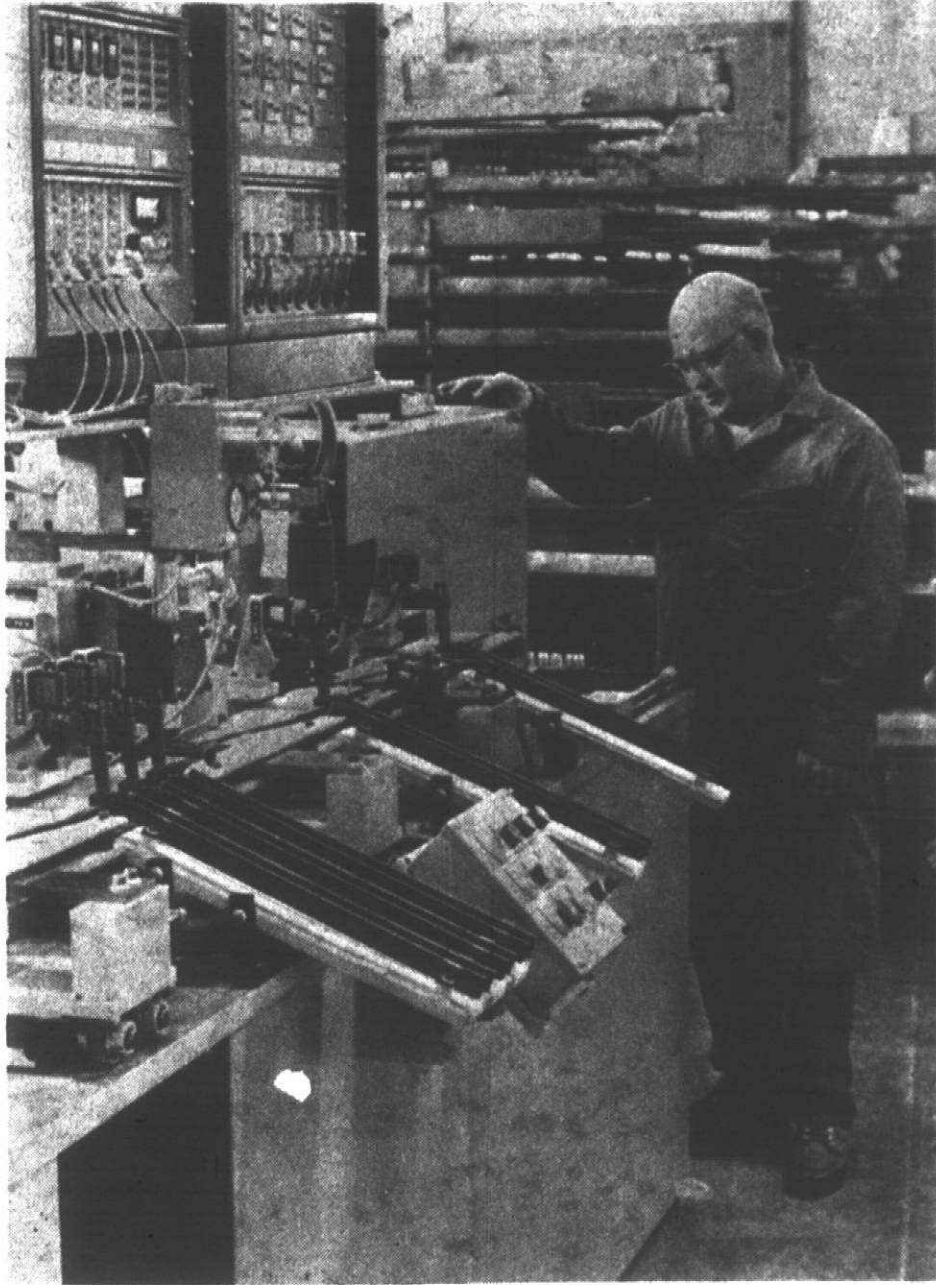

Food and auto industries depend on local workers

Big business in this country has been steadily losing popularity in the public eye. Revelations of illegal contributions to political candidates, and skyrocketing prices, have accounted for consumer discontent with major enterprises.

The International Telephone and Telegraph (ITT) Corporation is one such company that is concerned with its reputation. Locally, the ITT Industrial and Automation Systems plant in Plymouth is increasing its efforts to familiarize residents with its products.

Located at Plymouth Road and Haggerty, ITT produces gage, assemble and test systems for the automotive industry, in addition to large-scale metal detector systems.

Through these two programs, ITT Industrial and Automation Systems is working indirectly for the benefit of the consumer. What's more encouraging is that all design and construction work of the highly technicalized systems is done in the Plymouth plant.

ITT EMPLOYS 65 highly-skilled workers, most of whom reside in the Plymouth-Canton area. Together, they build machinery that inspects 70 per cent of all disc brake rotors manufactured in this country.

The Plymouth ITT plant makes test evaluations for nearly every moving part of an automobile. By building machines that transport and inspect parts of all complex shapes and sizes with precision and accuracy, ITT systems provide for safe transportation.

Included in its inspection system process are engine, transmission, wheel and steering assemblies. When these parts are properly gaged by ITT systems, they are virtually guaranteed from defect.

From the auto companies standpoint, the purpose of doing business with ITT is to avoid recalls, which are expensive and provide for poor exposure. Heavy warranty costs also contribute to the popularity of ITT systems.

THE LATEST recall concerns defective gas caps on Chevrolet Chevettes—a part that could have been gaged by ITT. Since

a part that meets ITT standards has never been subject to a recall, General Motors might be interested in adding gas caps to its long list of parts already inspected.

Metal detectors offer another service beneficial to the consumer, not in the way of striking gold in one's backyard, but by combing foods, lumber, rubber, surgical tools and most anything imaginable for bits of steel or metal.

Banks use metal detectors to locate credit cards (that's what the dark strip on the back is for), bakers for inspection of goods, pharmacists for drugs and tobacco companies for cigarettes.

ITT's detector systems consist of conveyor belts transporting goods through detectors, which range in width from eight to 200 inches. The systems range in price from \$1,600 to \$5,000.

PLYMOUTH POLICE use metal detection equipment provided by ITT each Halloween to locate metal objects in candy collected by youngsters.

More than 800 youngsters take advantage of the service annually, by dropping in the police department on Halloween

night or the following day.

ITT first volunteered the use of its equipment several years ago when parents reported their children were given candy containing razor blades and other hazardous metal objects. The program is now in its sixth year.

"We haven't detected any metal in the candies since the program started, but we intend to continue with this community service," said Morton Wylie, director of sales and services for ITT. "Kids like to wrap pennies up and see the detector sound off and sometimes the device will pick up tin foil."

The Plymouth operation is one of 24 ITT corporation units in Michigan. ITT employs 3,300 persons in the state, will gross an estimated \$135 million and pay a total of \$4 million in state and local taxes.

It is evident that ITT is making a concerted effort to protect consumers on the local level. Through the nature of its work and contributions to the community, one can scratch ITT Industrial and Automation Systems off the list of big businesses dissatisfying their customers.

No 'economic calamity' for '77

The six per cent growth in the real gross national product predicted by President-elect Jimmy Carter and Federal Reserve Chairman Arthur Burns will be difficult to attain, but a growth of five to 5.5 per cent is likely in 1977, according to a top Detroit area economist.

Dr. Thomas D. Thomson, vice-president and chief economist for Detroit Bank and Trust Co., told the Detroit Economic Club: "The year 1977 is not going to be among our best, but those seeing calamity are not going to have their prophecies fulfilled."

Thomson predicted some reduction in unemployment from the current 8.1 per cent to 6.5 or 6.75 by the end of the new year.

And his assessment of the overall economy was that most indicators will continue to show recovery.

THE REASON he doubted the Carter-Burns prediction of six per cent growth in GNP is that the sum total of goods and services is growth at a rate of 3.5 to 4.0 per cent in the current quarter.

If the overall 1977 growth rate were to be six per cent, Thomson said, "We would have to accelerate from the present growth pattern to an average of a little over seven per cent during the next four quarters. Although I am fairly optimistic about 1977, I don't expect this much acceleration in growth."

He called the unemployment uncomfortably high, but pointed out it was due to the slow growth of the economy and the rapid rise in the labor force. Many families are attempting to have more than one member employed. It is hard for our economy—or any economy—to absorb the type of structural shift we have had.

MOST INTERNAL signs looked good to Thomson, but he pointed to several "all signs."

Retail sales have been more or less flat for several months. Automobile sales have been disappointing since the middle of September. Industrial production has been down two months in a row.

But he predicted no repetition of the 1974-75 recession—and even noted that some things were turning out better than predicted a year ago.

Prices, in particular, are behaving better than most people thought possible. Wholesale prices are up only 4.0 per cent over a year ago. Unit labor costs and consumer prices have risen a little over 5.0 per cent.

He predicted consumer prices would rise 5.6 per cent in 1977, stimulated in part by an expected Arab oil price hike and the long-needed deregulation of natural gas.

strong and improve. Thomson was less buoyant about capital goods.

"Our economy has not been adding much to its capital stock. The low level of operating capacity and dubiousness concerning the economic outlook have dampened this sector."

He looked for an increase of 8.3 per cent (\$126 billion) in real business fixed investment, but called those figures "far less than we would normally expect in the third year of business recovery."

"The problem of underinvestment will only be solved when confidence rebuilds in the long-run health of the economy. Capital goods will not perform well on a cyclical basis until boom-bust expectations fade further."

Thomson earned his MBA degree from Indiana University and his PhD from the University of Chicago. He was an officer of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System and chief of its economic section before joining the Detroit bank.

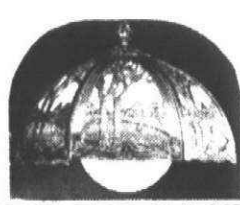
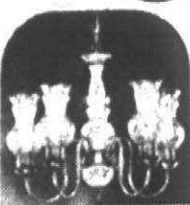

'77 to be best auto sales year since '73

What "economic pause"? The auto industry is going to have the best unit sales year in 1977 since the high-water mark set in 1973.

That was the assessment of Brent T. Upson, General Motors Corp.'s director of economic relations. Upson told the Detroit Economic Club sales would hit 14.5 million cars and trucks, "only slightly behind the 14.6 million unit record of 1973."

The GM economist insisted on lumping car and truck sales "because many trucks are now purchased as personal transportation vehicles—as second 'cars'—and thus they are direct substitutes for car purchases."

WHAT MAY HAVE been the reasons for an apparent pause late in 1976, said Upson, were the month-long strike against Ford, the shortage of some models and the long model changeover time at some GM plants.

In fact, he said there will be a spurt of "make-up" sales as the result of the Ford strike.

Most importantly, he said, "the consumer mood is clearly positive." He cited a University of Michigan survey showing about 40 per cent of those surveyed thought the next 12 months would be a good time to buy a car—"the most positive response since early 1972."

Overall, 1977 sales will run about five per cent ahead of 1976, he said. This is about the same as the overall rate of economic growth predicted by other economists and

IN THE LONG RUN, his optimism was tempered by this warning.

"Both existing and future legislative provisions crippling the industry" may go into effect, he cited.

Emission control standards which "specify that 1978 models must meet standards which we cannot achieve on a production basis. Thus, as the law now stands, it is technically possible that we and every other producer would be prohibited from making cars for sale to U.S. customers."

Fuel economy regulations would have "less severe" effects. The law sets a goal of 18 miles per gallon in 1978 for combined city-highway driving, 20 mpg by 1980 and 27.5 mpg by 1985. "Recent events should prove to everyone that we will have very little luck in selling our products if people don't really want to buy them."

Ignoring these "legislated risks," Upson projected total sales of 16 million vehicles by 1980 in the U.S. and 40 million for the free world.

Upson has been with GM since receiving his MA in economics from the University of Minnesota in 1948.

MSU will show how to trim your heat bills

If you're concerned about heat loss from your house affecting your heating bill, the Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service can provide free information.

MSU Extension agricultural engineers James Boyd and Leslie Mack have designed a computer program which analyzes factors in your house which affect heating costs. The computer approximates costs and savings resulting from improvements such as insulation or putting new caulking on windows.

"These are approximate costs, but we do feel they are in the ballpark with current prices. We also have an inflation factor built into the computer program," says Mack.

Here's how the program works. Obtain a weather-proofing houses computer data sheet from the local county extension office. The data sheet is a checklist to guide you in inspecting your house. The checklist takes into account the condition of window caulk, number of windows and doors in the house, if storm windows will be used, condition of weatherstripping around doors, how much insulation is in the attic, etc.

After you've compiled the information send it to Mack or Boyd, Agricultural Engineering Department, Michigan State University, East Lansing 48824.

The information will be fed into a computer to determine the costs for possible home heating improvements. In the near future, for more convenience, this data will be phoned into computers from county extension offices.

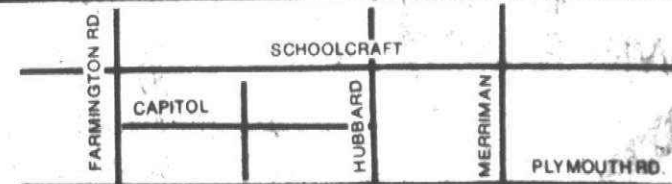

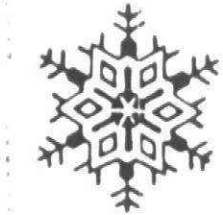

Dissidents could work to force police millage

Monday night's special Canton Township board meeting reached a new low in audience etiquette when at various points people in the audience booed members of the board, booed, interrupted, and yelled out threats such as, "It's about time for a recall."

It's one thing to offer vehement constructive criticism as a Canton board watchdog. It's quite another matter to be rude and disruptive.

The crowd, which could have used some manners, was comprised of people who worked on the "Write-in the Greenstein Team." Many of the people in the group have come up with good suggestions but their dissent was grating Monday night.

They came to the meeting upset that new Supervisor, Harold Stein decided to cut one patrol unit because the police department is running well over budget—a budget that was prepared by Robert Greenstein, defeated supervisor and deposed police chief.

If these people truly want to expand the police department, they should spend their time drumming up citizen support for a police millage and not wasting energy with shrill wisecracks.

The main spokesmen for the "watchdogs" are Thom Carman and Jim Donahue, chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals. Carman and Donahue also led the write-in effort.

They, along with Gerald Neizgoda, a Canton reserve officer, came to the special meeting to "expose" what they felt was a serious tactical error committed by the new "interim" police chief, Carl Silvers.

Someone had even tipped off Channel 7 News, which arrived at the meeting and left when it was evident there would be no "disbanding of the police department" as had been rumored.

But according to the very vocal group, the Canton police had been called to a bar fight over the weekend and were told to "keep a low profile" until the Wayne County Sheriffs arrived.

What good are the recent certification diplomas, the group asked, if the Canton Police are not allowed to enforce the law?

Chief Silvers, who confessed that he was fighting stage fright, walked up to the hot seat and stood his ground admirably.

Silvers tried to explain to the dissenters that while his men have certification, they lack experience and could use every bit of assistance before walking into a volatile situation in a bar.

"We don't send Christians into the lion's den these days," Silvers said. "It's best to get experienced police officers there." Silvers explained that his officers were "in a holding pattern" until they received proper backup protection.

What's so repulsive about that? That's sensible law enforcement—as opposed to storming the beachhead with a group of rookies. Any law enforcement officer will tell you that drunks, drivers and quarreling couples are the three most potentially dangerous situations an officer can face.

Many of the people who got up and talked at the meeting were the same people who pleaded with the board to keep Greenstein on as police chief. He's out. "Interim Chief Silvers" deserves a chance to prove himself in the department.

The Canton Police Department is, in theory, a full-scale, full-duty police department. But people in the township must realize that there are no detectives, no separate bureaus, no information network machines, and files. There's not even a lock-up.

There has never been a police millage.

The Canton Police were set up to work in conjunction with the existing police agencies such as the state police and the sheriff.

It is hoped that in the near future, voters will agree to expand that protection by supporting their police with increased taxes.

But don't fault the police chief for asking for additional help and don't blame Supervisor Stein for keeping the police department budget at the level set by the previous administration. Thirdly, stop booing and hissing when someone says something you disapprove of, it only serves to weaken your argument.

Detroit's capital

A green field for autos

Here's a conversation starter for a lull in the holiday cocktail party: Why did the automobile industry become concentrated in southeastern Michigan around the time of World War I?

You'll get the schoolbook answers first: Access to water transportation. A mid-point between the coal of the east and the iron of the upper Great Lakes. The presence of Henry Ford. A lot of engineers.

The truth is that southeast Michigan—specifically, Detroit—was far from unique in possessing those advantages. As of 1917, there were 184 auto companies scattered across the nation, and only 25 per cent of all cars were made in Michigan—and many of those in outstate cities.

THE ANSWER to why auto production became concentrated here is in the late Willis F. Dunbar's "Michigan: A History of the Wolverine State"—fine reading and a good Christmas gift still.

"There was a great deal of capital in Detroit, gained largely from lumbering and mining, which its owners were willing to invest in automobile-manufacturing facilities. It was difficult to persuade Eastern bankers to invest in what was regarded as a risky enterprise in the early years. These appear to be some of the reasons that Detroit and Michigan early became the focal point for automotive development and production."

A sick industry finds itself sicker

"Depression" is not too strong a word to describe the state of the construction in metropolitan Detroit. In the depression of the 1930s, unemployment hit 25 per cent, which is the current level of joblessness among construction workers in this tri-county area.

Yet a construction executive, speaking to the Detroit Economic Club, tells us that residential construction costs rose one per cent a month in the last year. That's 12 per cent for the year. That's double-digit inflation.

Is it any wonder, then, that the construction industry is depressed? Isn't the plain truth that the industry has simply priced itself out of the market?

Here is an industry where labor led the way in gouging out big wage increases in the 1960s, and where management joined in by showing a pronounced preference for building a few units at high prices rather than many units at low prices.

No one—not even Jimmy Carter and a friendly Congress—can veto the law of supply and demand. It is hard to find tears to shed for the construction industry.

"A great deal of capital," the man said. I couldn't remember being taught that in school. I wondered if Prof. Dunbar wasn't engaging in one of the wild generalizations historians often make.

THEN A FRIEND stumbled onto a rare volume you can't buy any more—the 1914 edition of "The Book of Detroiters," edited by Albert Nelson Marquis.

It's kind of a "Who's Who" of that era but devoted mainly to the rich and the publicity seekers, since Henry Ford isn't mentioned.

Consider the listing of Russell A. Alger Jr. (b. 1873): First a wholesale manufacturer of lumber, then a vice-president of Packard Motor Car Co.

His brother, Fred M. Alger (b. 1876), the father of the Republican politician of the 1940s and '50s: Fred Sr. was a director of Alger, Smith & Co., lumber manufacturers, and a director of Manistique Lumbering Co. before becoming a director of Packard and of Anderson Forge and Machine.

Henry B. Joy (b. 1864) was an office boy, then a clerk, then went into the mining business in Utah from 1887-89, and later became president of Packard.

Samuel L. Smith made a fortune in lumbering and furnished funds to organize Olds Motor Works in 1899.

John Kelsey (b. 1866) worked for paper and lumber companies and finally became president of Kelsey Wheel Co., a familiar name.

Allen H. Zacharias (b. 1875) retired in 1908 from the coal business; later he organized Detroit Pressed Steel Co., makers of auto frames and heavy stampings.

Dunbar was right, it seems. Auto companies required capital, and Detroiters had capital.

IT'S NOT FASHIONABLE to say nice things about capital... big money... the interests. Not in Reutherstown. But on a newspaper you can get away with being unfashionable.

If America became the world's most muscular economic power, it had less to do with the egalitarianism of Jefferson and Jackson than with the policies of Treasury Secretary Hamilton, who got the Revolutionary War debts paid off and gave the fledgling nation a credit rating in Europe that attracted vast amounts of capital.

So when Bob Cratchit offers a Christmas toast to his employer, read your history before you join Mrs. Cratchit in sneering, "Mr. Scrooge, indeed!"

Suppose Abraham Lincoln felt that he could make more money practicing law in the private sector than submitting himself to the public for election to public office, because everyone believ-

Growing up too fast

The grieving child-as-adult learned lessons

Some guy on the desk at the Associated Press had the right idea.

Last Sunday was the 21st birthday of Mary Vecchio, so let's run a piece on what has happened to Mary since 1970. Good idea? Let's go.

You don't remember who Mary Vecchio is or why her 21st birthday is important? Well, neither did I—until I read the rest of the story.

Mary Vecchio is the girl who appeared sobbing, arms upraised in grief and disbelief, in the famous photograph of one of the kids shot during the anti-Vietnam War demonstrations at Kent State University in 1970.

Her story is one that would sound familiar to many families in these suburbs whose kids were in their teens in the late 1960s and early '70s.

MARY WAS RAISED in a comfortable suburb, Opa Locka, in California. One of six children. Father a strict disciplinarian, a port authority foreman. School not so good, so Mary dropped out and split. "Ran away" is a better term.

It seems, though, that she ran to get away from home rather than to get into radical politics. Evidently she just drifted from place to place for awhile, winding up at Kent State. There, the 14-year-old girl from the suburbs suddenly encountered a death she hadn't anticipated and a photographic notoriety she didn't need.

The anti-war movement. The counter-culture. Hippies. Haight-Ashbury. Dope and LSD and uppers and downers.

That seems like a long time ago, back in 1970 when the Ohio National Guard opened fire on campus demonstrators. But it is only six years.

BACK THEN AT THIS newspaper, we kept getting frantic calls from parents whose son or daughter had run off. They would ask us for advice about how to get in touch, which papers they could put a want ad in, how other parents had handled the same situation. When the phone rang, you'd die inside a little more, because you knew you couldn't do much of anything.

We were covering anti-war demonstrations at Schoolcraft College, terrorist-mischiefous bombings at Oakland Community College, disputes over dress and hair regulations in local high schools. We worried about whether our reporters and editors were too old to get in touch with the kids they were covering.

It was a strange and peculiar time, when 14-year-olds were suddenly major news sources, making the breaking stories. And when their parents or their teachers or coaches—whom you might have expected to be news makers—were instead only confused and frightened onlookers.

TODAY, OF COURSE, times are different. Kids are still running away from home or taking drugs or participating in demonstrations, but the fre-

quency and intensity have gone down remarkably. It would be nice to report that Mary Vecchio went straight after her brush with the real world that no 14-year-old newsmaker can ever imagine. But I can't do that.

Evidently there were hard times. Traveling aimlessly back and forth across the country. A no-contest plea to a charge of prostitution and mas-saging without a license in Miami.

But it's not all bad. She's living with a family in a suburb. She's lost around 100 pounds; she doesn't have so many nightmares; and she is thinking about enrolling in a local community college.

REALITY IS HARD, for everybody involved.

For kids, caught in an absurd situation, where freedom's goal conflicted directly with a bad home life and an unresponsive society, the process of growing up from 14 to 22 took only one or two years. And cost 30.

For parents, puzzled and horrified at what tensions existed between their hard-won world and the rages of their children, the wrench came as they became onlookers while their children became news events.

For the suburbs, it was a time of terrific strain. The kids who were running away or dropping out or taking dope were voting with their feet against a way of life which the times asked them to judge when they were only still in their early teens.

They judged it, in some ways accurately and in other ways inaccurately. But with their judgment and the shock waves that process set off in their parents' hearts and their community's head, they ended the age of innocence of the suburbs.

Now all parties are growing up. The kids, evidently, are gradually going back to school, increasingly suspicious of dope (though still drinking). The parents are a little more sensitive to the absurdities of their society. And the society is a little more understanding that you simply cannot place a population under the kinds of stresses as occurred in the late 1960s without hearing something snap.

Looking at the re-run of the picture of Mary Vecchio, the grieving child as adult, I cannot help but hope that we all have learned lessons we won't forget. I doubt it!

'Catch 22' will deter CORP from its aim

Editor:

Led by city commissioners Jack Moehle and Beverly McAninch, and by Mr. and Mrs. Roger Wright of CORP, Plymouth voters fell into a trap when they vetoed the almost completed plans for a senior citizens apartment building here in Plymouth so desperately needed by our older residents. Most of them will be gone by the time the "taskforce" and other "study" groups finish their work.

The "Catch 22" which will prevent any meaningful fulfillment of our recently demonstrated housing needs is the requirement for federal subsidy payments. These are administered by MSHDA. MSHDA has its own set of specifications as to site location, design, management organization and the like based on many years of successful operation of such projects.

All the well-meaning "taskforce" and "citizen involvement" groups aren't going to have much effect on its decisions. Too many other communities are ready to accept MSHDA conditions and to enjoy the facilities that result.

When Plymouth voters rejected one of these conditions (tax abatement) they gave up their place at the head of the line and to start a new project we will have to start over and face newer and more restrictive requirements. This usually takes about six years.

Forest City-Dillon, meanwhile, will building a high-rise building which will comply with MSHDA requirements. It will cost \$6 million. The people of Plymouth will pay their share of its construction and subsidy costs. Unfortunately, the older people of Plymouth who need it will not live in it. It will be built in some other city because the voters of Plymouth were led astray by an "alternative plan" which didn't exist.

Oh, we may get a "Bandaid" addition to Tonquish Creek Manor in the form of a few more very low income units, but the demonstrated need for middle income housing for the present and for the future is a

long way down the road.
Let's fact it, voters, we blew it! Let's not forget the people who promised an "alternative plan" and then couldn't deliver.

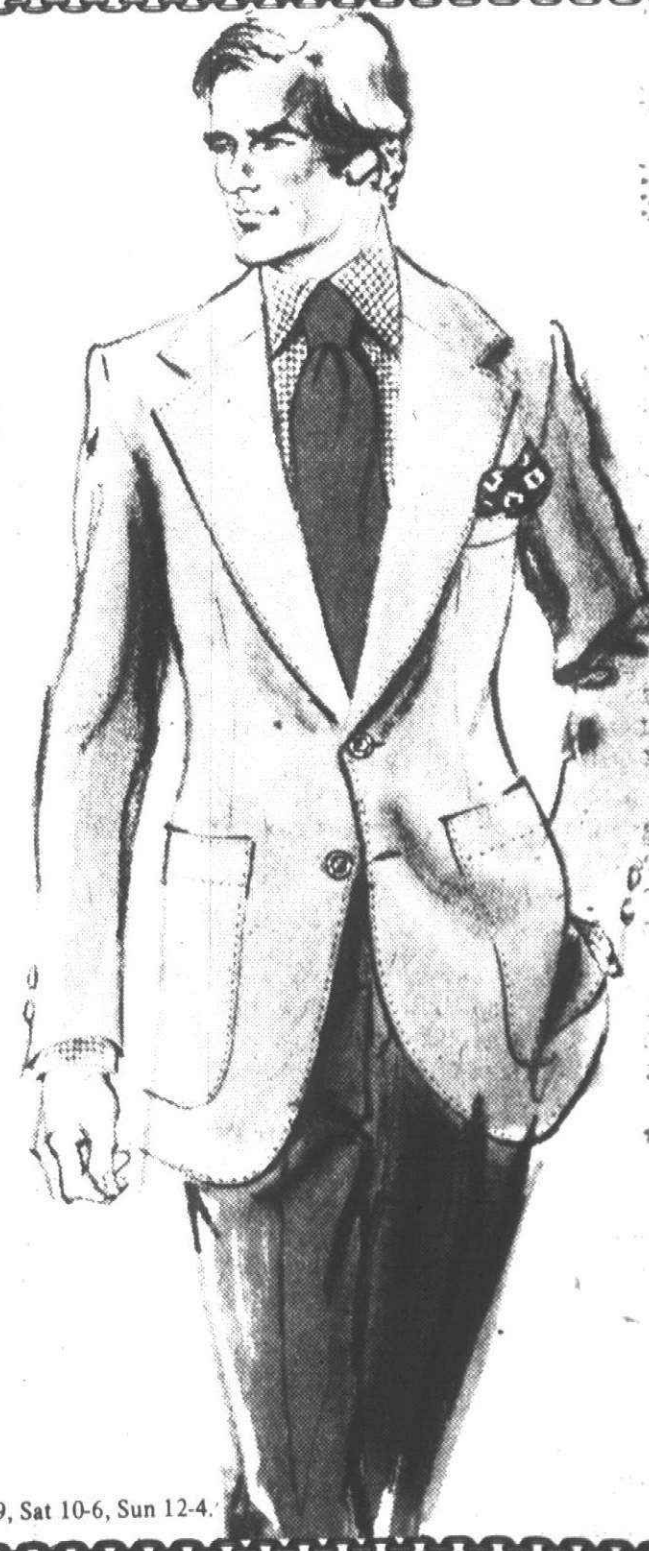

Canton is bursting at seams: Bundarin

The political dust is beginning to settle in Canton and things are getting back to normal.

The election is over, the new administration has been sworn in, Robert Greenstein has been regulated to the position of a part-time patrolman and I am back to writing letters to the editor on the issues facing Canton.

On the horizon of the political scene, the rumbles of new charges and countercharges between Stein and Greenstein can be heard developing. However, regardless of the potential threats facing the new administration, they must step up and assume the authority on the issues and problems facing our township. While in theory such commissions are appealing, if these commissions are not given proper direction and time schedules in which to work, they become, in reality, vehicles for procrastination.

The new administration is proposing citizens' advisory commissions to study many of the issues facing our township. While in theory such commissions are appealing, if these commissions are not given proper direction and time schedules in which to work, they become, in reality, vehicles for procrastination.

The responsibility of those who were elected to serve the people and make the decisions to guide our township's development cannot be lessened by the in-

stitution of advisory commissions to study issues. Our elected officials must still stand up to their responsibility on the major issue facing Canton, which continues to be our unregulated residential growth rate with its adverse impact on our school system, roads and highways, water and sewer capacities, fire and police protection and recreation facilities.

This issue has become so critical that the residents of neighboring communities who live in our common school district are becoming disturbed by the impact of our growth rate on them and our inability to cope with our growth problems.

TO FURTHER COMPLICATE Canton's problem, the new administration does not seem to comprehend that there are very basic differences between the issue of land use planning and the issue of growth control.

While I accept the fact that they are related, I strongly argue that they are wholly separate. Land use planning decisions ultimately determine the population density in a community. Growth control is the method by which a community regulates the rate at which it attains the density of population for which its land use plan requires.

The rural residents of our township, who for the most part supported Mr. Stein, were aggrieved by the land use planning programs of Robert Greenstein. In response to this grievance, at the first township meeting after being sworn in, the new administration proposed a commission to study land use planning.

I make no quarrel with this proposal, however I do not believe that this action satisfies the grievances of the subdivision residents on our growth rate. Without such a policy, the services that will be demanded by the increasing number of new residents moving into our community will not be provided in an orderly and economically efficient manner.

I do not accept the rationalized excuse of the new administration that they have only recently taken power so they need time to study the issues and problems facing Canton. Each of them has been actively campaigning for over six months for the positions they now hold. Surely they must have formulated some concepts or proposals during this period of time on how to meet the problems facing Canton, other than to institute citizen's advisory commissions.

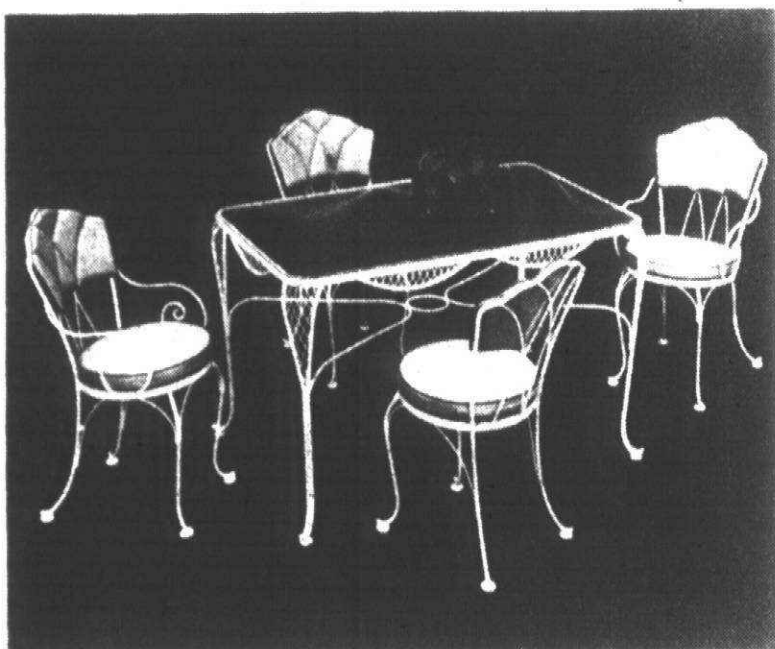
For devoted anglers, winter means "tip-up" season in Michigan, when the old fishin' hole is a hole in the ice.

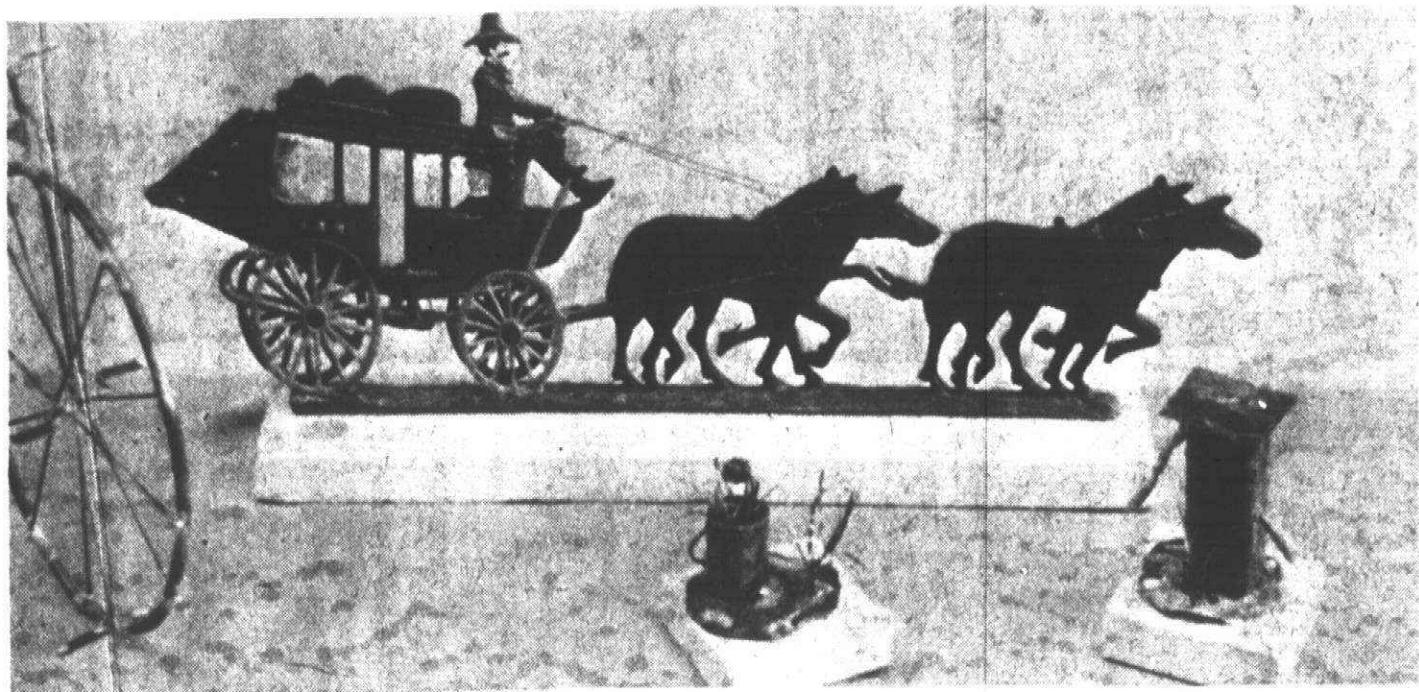

Customers could choose from a wide variety of buckles to go with the belts.

"It takes about three hours to finish one belt," said Ms. Flora who started working with leather four years ago.

GAYLE WHITE and her daughters Doris and Karen all had a hand in creating the gifts for their booth.

The dough ornaments, plaques and Christmas decorations were Mrs. White's handiwork.

Karen is the macrame expert. She made the wall hangings, plant hangers and jewelry.

BETWEEN CUSTOMERS, Elaine Doughty was knitting.

Mrs. Doughty works for the engineering and building department of the City of Plymouth. Her hobby is knitting and there was an array of purses, mittens and scarves on one end of her table in the multi-purpose room.

On the other end were wooden toys made by her husband, Bill, who is a construction teacher at Plymouth Canton High School.

The trucks, cars and trains were sanded and polished to bring out the natural grain and beauty of the wood.

"Bill had a heart attack a while ago, so he can't be here today," said Mrs. Doughty as she admired the smooth classic lines of the toys.

GEORGE STEFUREAC, a Canton Town-

ship resident, is an electrician by trade. His hobby is working with wood.

Among his creations were a chess board with hand-carved pieces.

His candle lanterns were just right for the holiday season and the shelves at the rear of his booth were lined with wooden animals.

These were actually jigsaw puzzles which could be taken apart and reassembled. When fitted together, they were sturdy enough to be played with in the animal form.

In the next booth were a pair of photographers, Charles Lusk and Robert Smith, both of Plymouth.

Their unusual color portraits and landscapes deserved custom framing—so they added picture framing to their skills.

They had a wide selection of their framed photographs at the show.

TWO PLYMOUTH HIGH School graduates who turned their cabinet-making skills into a full time business are David Catton and Tracy Shelley.

"Made in the Shade," their trademark, appears on everything from large tables

and desks to smaller items like cheese boards, bread boards, chopping blocks and even clocks.

They will make pieces to order—all they need is a sketch of the Shaker wood box or candle table desired.

The hallmark of their cutting boards is the careful blending of several woods and the satin smoothness of the surfaces.

Another artist in woodworking is Norbert Battermann, Plymouth city commissioner, whose specialty is Shaker furniture.

Battermann's fine Shaker items include holders for plates, candles, and hurricane shades. He makes shelves of all lengths with the wooden Shaker pegs, candle tables and accessories.

How does he find time for his hobby? "I have to be busy," said Battermann. "I can't just sit and watch television all evening. I usually work in my shop after dinner until about 10."

He admits football games and news broadcasts do take priority over his Shaker furniture.

OTHER LOCAL TALENT represented at the crafts show were Jack Hoffman and his metal sculptures, Kathy Coleman's ceramics and Sharon McCann's Christmas decorations and gift items.

Hoffman's metal pieces are sometimes whimsical and sometimes full of the motion of flying gulls. Whether it's a child with a handful of balloons, an athlete, or a youngster on a sled, a touch of humor brings life to his creations.

Kathy Coleman lives on Canton Center Road in Plymouth Township. Her ceramic figures include animals and birds as well as useful household gadgets.

Sharon McCann came to the area two years ago from Missouri. She shared a booth with her sister, Nancy Graves.

They had dough decorations, calico pillows embroidered in cross-stitch, stuffed tree ornaments, and antique chocolate molds mounted on wooden plaques.

Charles Wells manned the candle booth for his son, Richard. Hand-dipped and molded candles, tin candle holders and homemade soaps are Wells' featured wares.

Residents have come to count on stocking up on their seasonal candles at craft shows and the Plymouth Symphony League Antique Mart.

The three-day show gave everyone an opportunity to add a touch of thoughtfulness to their holiday gift-giving.

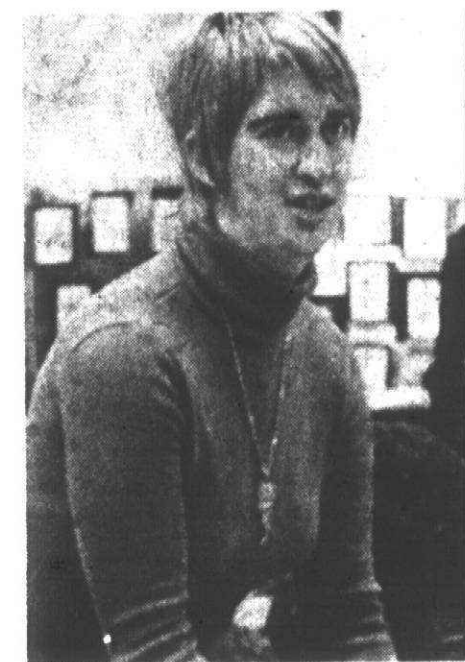

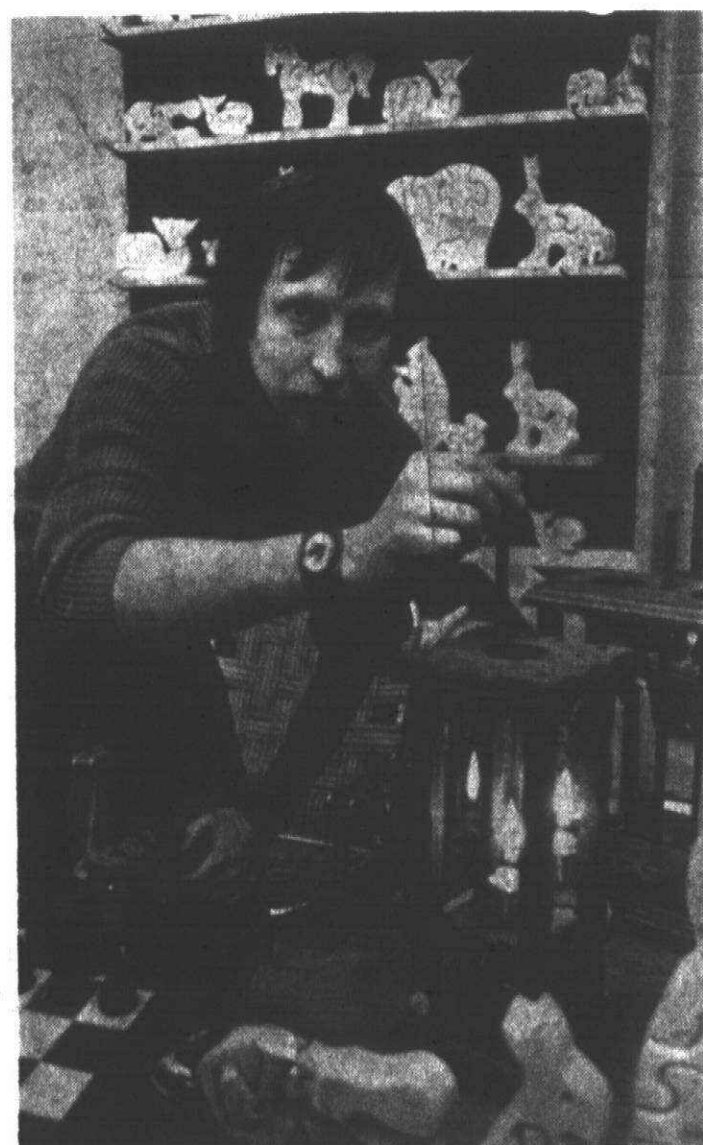

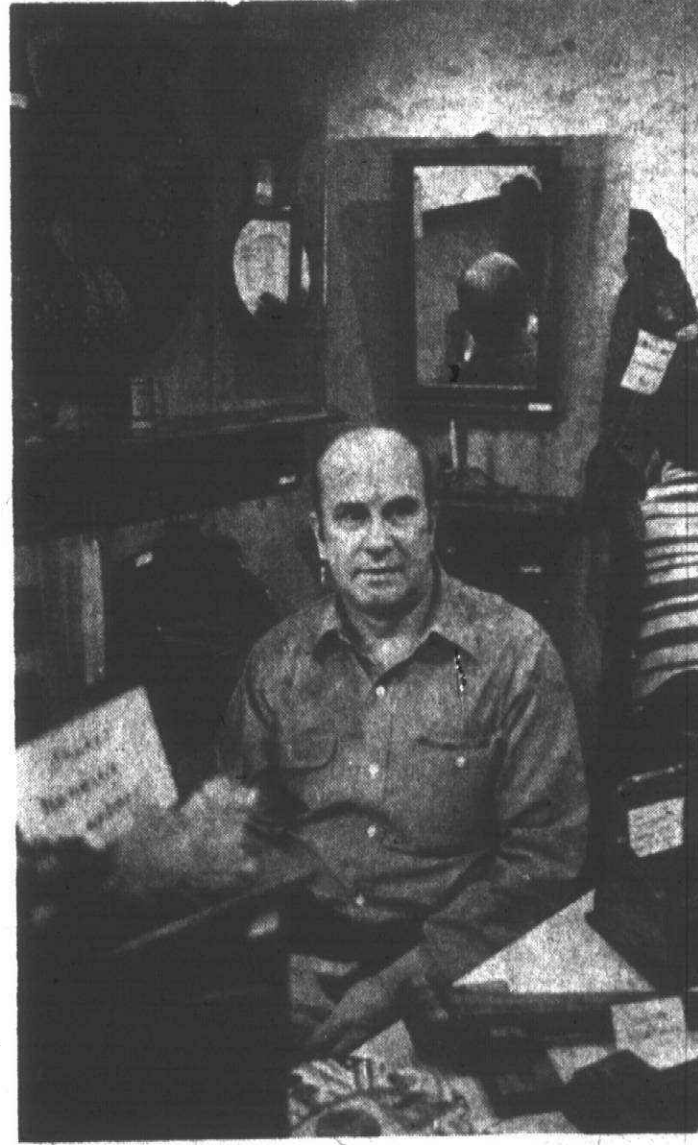

Aluminum siding, gutters and aluminum storm door and window frames, and lawn furniture tubing are also worth 15 cents a pound if properly prepared.

This aluminum must be free of all foreign materials, cut to lengths not exceeding three feet and should not be mixed with aluminum cans.

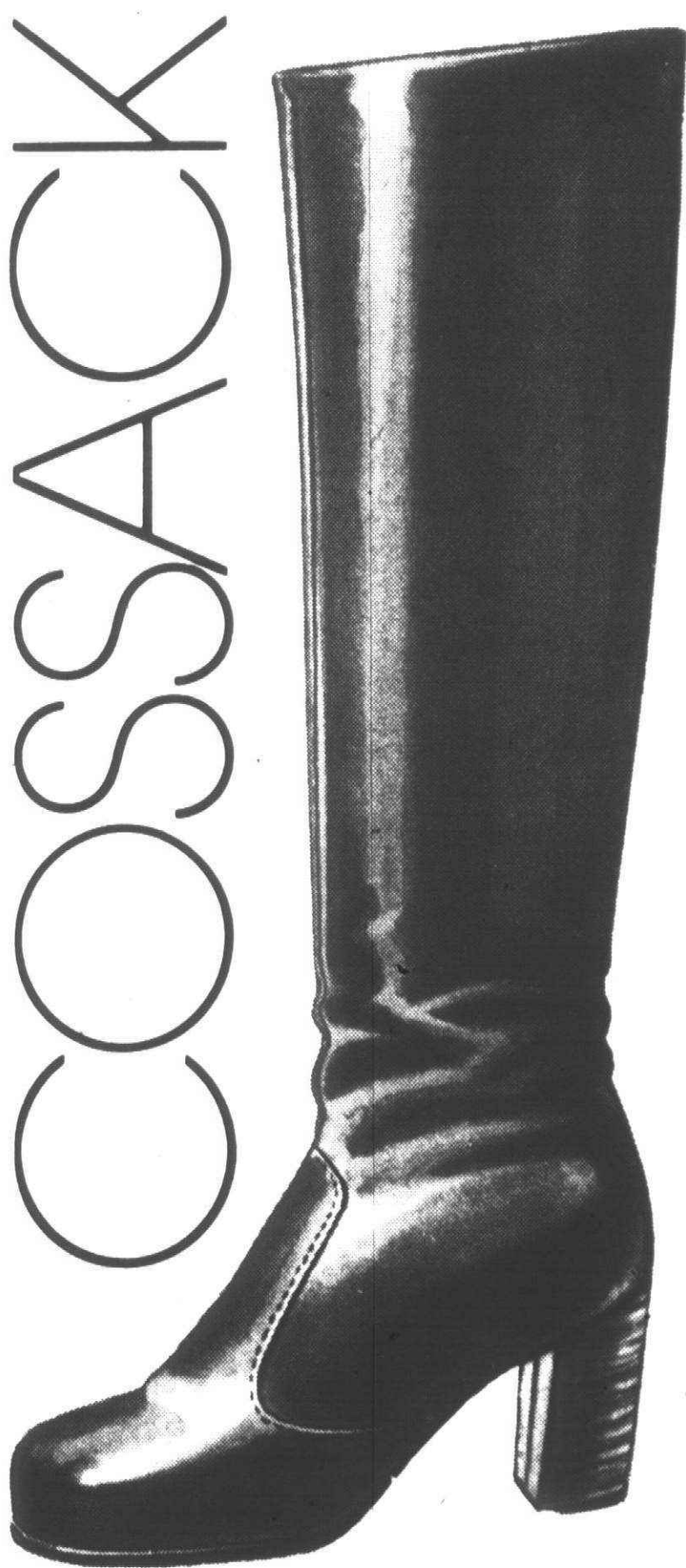

Jesse tree to shower gifts

The Jesse tree that sprung forth in Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Plymouth is bare now, but its fruit will be coming to the church this weekend to make Christmas a little better for a lot of people in the Plymouth community.

The tree sitting at a side altar in the sanctuary held, at the start of the Advent season, some 300 tags with church symbols on one side and a request for a special gift for someone in need on the other.

"The tags are all gone now," said the Rev. Bob Keller, the priest who has helped the Jesse tree come into fruition for two Christmases now.

And that means that members of the parish are preparing 300 special Christmas gifts for persons who might otherwise have a holiday as bare as the branches of the tree.

The tree starts with biblical symbolism, Fr. Keller explained.

"Jesse was the father of David, so the Jesse Tree is the family tree of Jesus," he said. "In the symbolism of the church, it is adorned with many religious figures, from the star of David and Noah's Ark to the cross and the rainbow."

For the OLCG tree, these symbols were placed on the front of little tags. Then the church asked several Plymouth organizations, Opportunity House, the Detroit House of Correction, Our Lady of Providence school and several convalescent

homes, to supply names of persons who would like to receive gifts.

Members of the parish came up with other names, those of persons in the community who could use some extra cheer at Christmas.

Each recipient placed on a card, some by name and some anonymously, was asked what he or she would like to receive, and that suggestion was written on the card too.

"There were all kinds of requests," Fr. Keller said. "One guy asked for a six-pack of beer. He'll get it, too; why give him something he won't use?"

Other more conventional requests were for underclothing, gloves, toys, cosmetics.

As the tree sat beside a side altar in the sanctuary, parishioners of Our Lady of Good Counsel were invited to come by and take a tag, and in the course of a couple of

Sundays, they stripped it bare.

The wrapped presents will be returned to the church at masses this Saturday and Sunday and the distribution to the recipients in the community will take place during the coming week.

"It's an expression of awareness of Christian service, taking care of the needs of the poor," Fr. Keller said.

"We'd like to think it may give some hope to those who might not have hope."

Livonia Lutherans start Missouri Synod mission

A mission church for Livonians who wish affiliation with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod will begin regular weekly services in the Harry J. Will Funeral Home, Six Mile east of Newburgh, at 9 a.m. Sunday, Dec. 12.

Its leaders are Lutherans who have been affiliated with Livonia churches that in recent months took action to dissolve ties with the Missouri Synod in a doctrinary dispute.

A formal request to the synod to organize as a mission church will be made in the near future, according to Alan Drake, Livonian who has been a member of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

Drake, a science teacher at Edsel Ford High School, said the organizational moves began after Holy Trinity members voted about two to one on Nov. 21 to leave the Missouri Synod and join the recently-organized English Synod.

Earlier two other Missouri Synod churches in Livonia, Faith and All Saints, had taken similar action.

Their moves grew out of a dispute that has wracked the denomination for several years, since the election of Dr. J.A.O. Preus, a theological conservative, as synod president.

"THERE ARE PEOPLE in Livonia who

don't want to leave the Missouri Synod and want to have a church in their home community," said Drake, explaining that the separation now had been effected by all three Lutheran Missouri Synod churches in Livonia.

"Those of us leading this move want to remain in the Missouri Synod, and forming a mission church seems the only right way to do it."

"I guess most of us had hoped an agreement could be reached, but apparently that is not to be. We don't want to cause friction, but we do think this new group is going to go."

The first meeting for organization was held in Holy Trinity church the week after the vote to move to the English Synod, Drake said about 150 persons attended.

A second session the following week in St. Paul Lutheran Church of Northville

brought the naming of Jerry French, a Ford Motor Co. employee, as president of the group.

The regular meeting place then was offered by the Will Funeral Home.

DRAKE SAID the group has had assistance from the Rev. Ralph Schmidt of St. Paul in Northville and the Rev. Roy Pranschke of Hosanna-Tabor in Redford Township.

"We also will be working with students at Concordia College in Ann Arbor," he said.

The dispute that led the three Livonia churches to separate from the Missouri Synod has involved the dismissal of the president of Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, the establishment of a seminary in exile (Semex) and a split within the denomination's mission program.

Star of the East has astrological verification



Johannes Kepler has been described as "a mixture of scholar and quack," who mixed liberal doses of astrology with his astronomy. As imperial mathematician and astronomer royal, he was observing the stars in Prague shortly before Christmas on Dec. 17, 1603.

That night, Saturn and Jupiter had a rendezvous in space within the constellation of Pisces. They moved so close together that they appeared to be one large brilliant star.

This started Kepler thinking. He suddenly remembered something he had read by the rabbinistic writer Abarbanel referring to the prophecy of Jewish astrologers that a Messiah would appear when there was a conjunction of Saturn and Jupiter in the constellation of Pisces.

Could he be observing the same "Star of Bethlehem" that the wise men had followed to find the Christ child?

He checked his calculations again and again. Astronomical and astrological tables seemed to agree that there was a threefold conjunction within the space of a year in 6 or 7 B.C.

HIS DISCOVERY was widely published at the time. But because of his "unscientific" leanings toward the occult and the realm of mysticism, serious scholars showed little interest in his theory, and rejected it without investigation.

Not until relatively recent years have scientists shown an interest. Now, in our own day, modern scientists agree that, as stated by the Encyclopedia Britannica:

"In the year 7 B.C. Jupiter and Saturn did, in fact, meet in Pisces and, as Kepler had already discovered, they met three times. Mathematical calculations further established that this three-fold conjunction was particularly visible in the Mediterranean area."

On May 29 it was visible for two hours in the morning sky. The second conjunction took place on Oct. 3.

On Dec. 4, for the third time that year, the two planets moved together, this time in the 10th degree of Pisces. At the end of January in the year 6 B.C. the planet Jupiter moved out of Pisces into Aries.

"We have seen the star in the east," said the wise men (Matt. 2:2). Modern scholars interpret the original Greek text "En te anatole" not as "the east," but as "the first rays of dawn." That would correspond exactly with the astronomical facts.

JUPITER WAS thought of by all nations as a lucky star and a royal star. According to ancient Jewish tradition, Saturn was supposed to protect Israel.

The Bible tells us, "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of Herod the king..." (Matt. 2:1). We know from numerous contemporary sources that Herod was designated king of Judea by the Romans in 40 B.C., and his reign ended with his death in 4 B.C.

Therefore, Jesus must have been born before 4 B.C. The brilliant star in St. Matthew's gospel points to the year 7 B.C.

Johannes Kepler seems not to have been so wrong after all, in his combination of astrological and astronomical studies.

King's jumper cans Belleville, 74-73

Chiefs nip Tigers at buzzer

Sophomore guard Butch King swished a 14-foot jump shot with only six seconds left to give Plymouth Canton a 74-73 victory over the Belleville Tigers in non-league action Tuesday night in the Plymouth gym.

For Canton, it was the first victory in three games, giving the squad momentum going into its Western Six League opener against Walled Lake Western Friday night.

But more importantly, this victory gave the young Chiefs some badly needed confidence in winning the close ones.

The Chiefs' two previous losses were both by four-point margins where they folded under pressure in the closing minutes.

But this time, it was Canton's turn to meet the test and not let another game slip away.

"We squeaked this one out," said a happy coach Casey Cavell. "As badly as we played, we had to have some luck this time."

"I was pleased with our offense and our good shot selection but we had sloppy mid-court play. We would break Belleville's

press but throw the ball away at mid-court."

Although Canton still had its plague of unnecessary turnovers the Chiefs forced Belleville into sloppy play as well.

The Chiefs didn't have the running ability for a fast break or the jumping ability on the boards that the Tigers had, but Canton continued to scrap the whole game until things went its way.

AND WHAT MADE it even more sweet was that Canton finally beat a Suburban Eight League team for the first time in its history.

With the score tied at 55-55 entering the final period, the Chiefs maintained the upperhand most of the final eight minutes—only to see the Tigers keep coming back. Canton opened up an eight-point margin, 69-61, with 2:17 left but that lead quickly dwindled when captain Rob Mandle fouled out of the game.

The key to the Chiefs' advantage in the final stanza was their staying out of foul trouble most of the time. When Mandle fouled out, it marked the first time Belleville had the bonus opportunity.

Mandle's leadership was sorely missed

the rest of the game as the Tigers quickly rebounded with seven straight points to cut the margin to one.

Two clutch free throws by Kevin Randazzo made it 71-68, but the Tigers tied things at 71-71 with only 35 seconds remaining.

Canton's Mandle followed with one free throw, but Belleville's Ron Johnson tipped in an offense rebound to give the Tigers a 73-72 lead with 13 seconds remaining.

CANTON QUICKLY called a timeout and set up King, who dribbled left just in front of the free throw line, twisted right and popped the ball through the nets.

The Tigers made a desperation pass to Kevin Barnes who missed an eight-footer as time expired, giving Canton the narrow victory.

Belleville held a narrow 16-15 lead after the first quarter and extended that margin to 28-19 midway in the second.

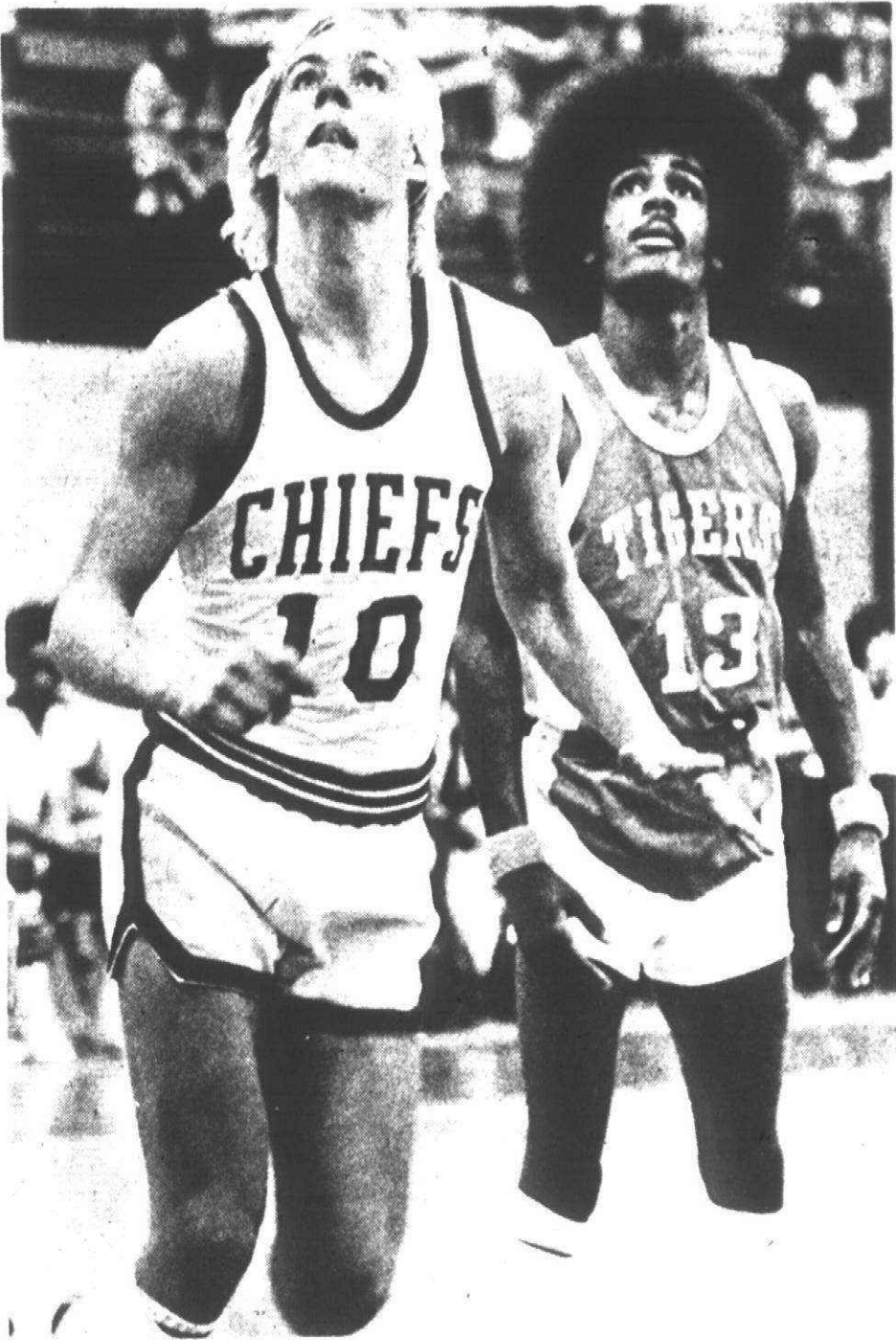
Reserve guard Doug Smith came in for Canton for the final three minutes of action and sparked the team with four points, cutting the margin to 36-33 at half-time.

The Chiefs' motion offense was exceptional against the Tigers as shown by forward Mike Albright's game-high 20 points. Albright moved well without the ball and found himself open on many occasions under the basket. It was the senior's finest all-around performance so far this season. The Chiefs shot an amazing 63 per cent from the floor.

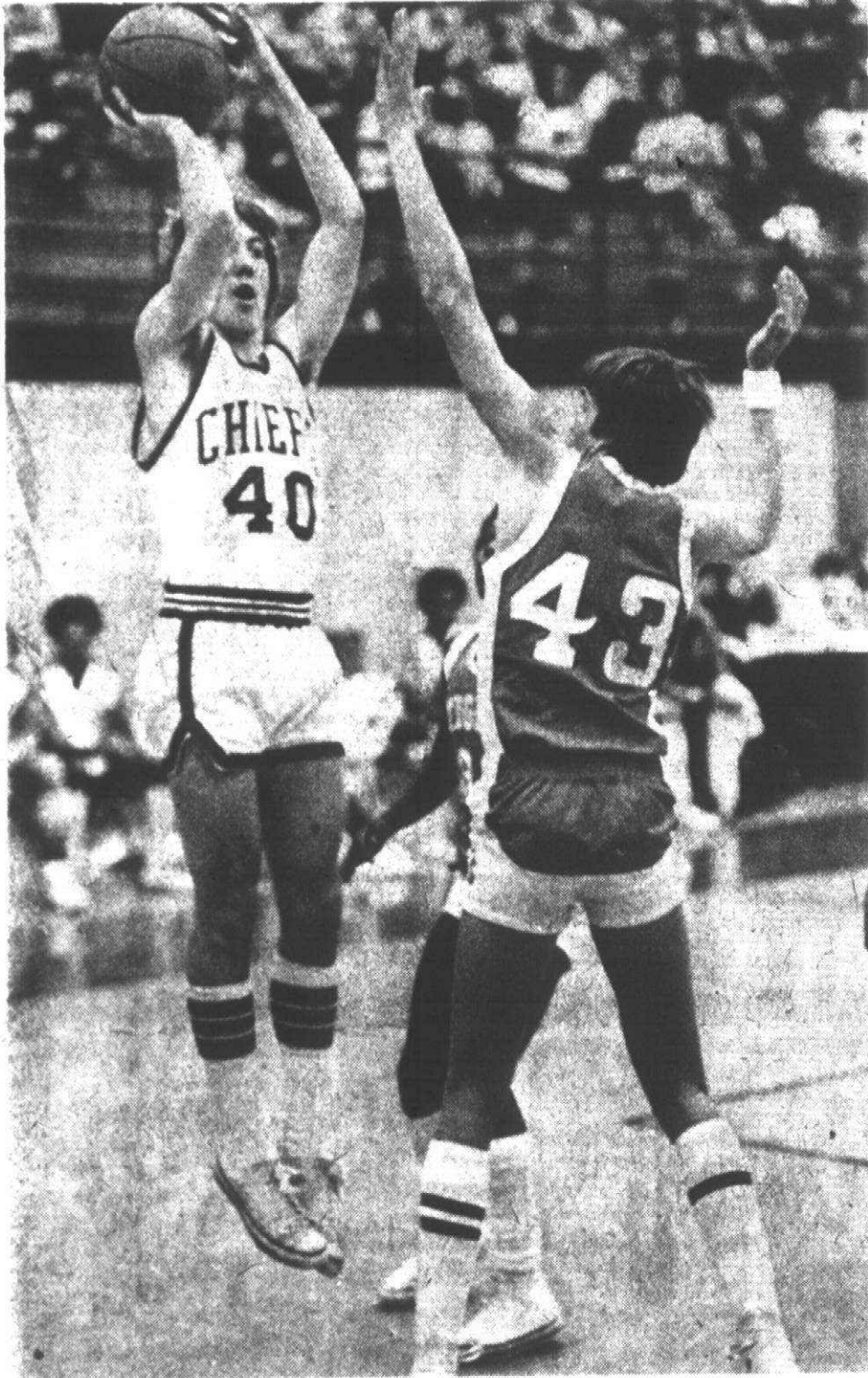
King added 16 to Canton's total and Keith Fueling continued his steady play with 13. Rob Mandle had 10.

passing well, had turnovers and missed foul shots."

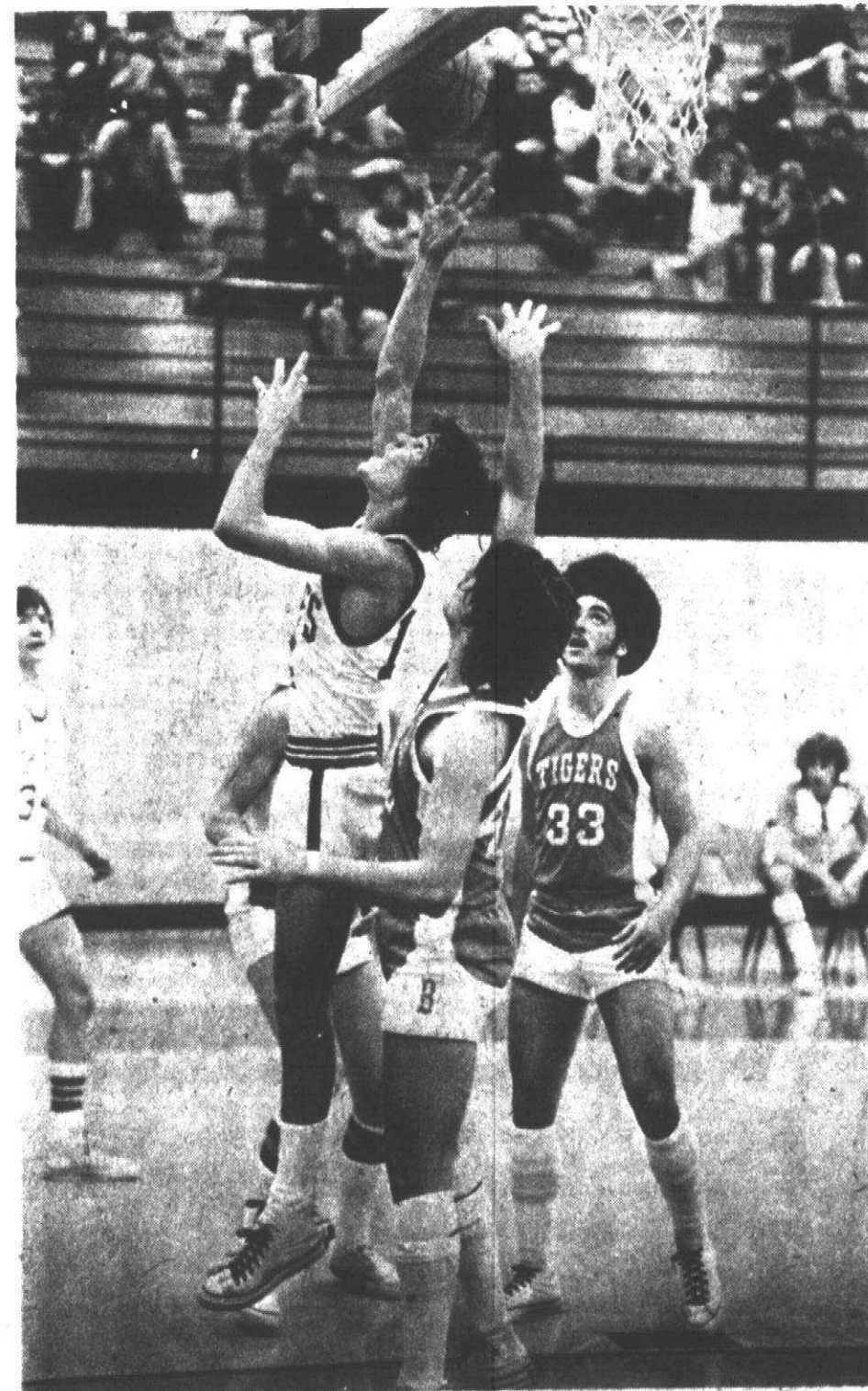
Ladywood never led during the contest, trailing 28-16 after the opening period, 45-27 at the intermission, 67-39 after three quarters and 78-63 at game's end.

Westland John Glenn exacted a long-awaited measure of revenge over intra-district rival Wayne last weekend with a 12-point victory over the Zebras—giving the Rockets the Western Wayne Invitational Wrestling Meet title.

The host Rockets, with four individual champions, one second-place finisher and three thirds, accumulated 123 points. Wayne, 201, and Farmington, 210, for a distant third-place team standing.

Wayne last year won the team title by 27 points over runnerup Glenn.

The Rockets received their best performance in the middle and heavier weight classes. Nick Paciocco, a state finalist last year, spearheaded Glenn past the other 11 teams competing for the invitational championship.

Paciocco, a senior, decided Wayne's Randy Pittman, 8-5, in a close duel for the 126-pound title. Mark Grabowski bested all comers in the 191-pound class for Glenn, as did Mike Collin and Jim Meyer in the 138- and 178-pound class, respectively.

Glenn's Jeff Doyle, a 165-pound competitor, dropped a tough 4-3 decision in the finals, but his second-place finish enabled the Rockets to collect some valuable points.

Dwight Barclay, Jerry Hensley and Rick Eisminger all placed third in their weight classifications for Glenn.

Wayne showed three individual champions—Bo Wanshon, 119 pounds, Tim Clark, 132 pounds, and Chris Bachus, 145 pounds.

Farmington improved by 10 points and one place over its performance at last year's invitational. Bruce McIntosh won the heavyweight crown for the Falcons on

one of the rare pins of the finals. Ron Stern, at 98 pounds, Marty Bona, 145 pounds, and Dean Schultz, 178 pounds, all placed second for Farmington.

"We won because we wrestled very well compared to our first meet against Plymouth Salem," said Glenn coach Bob Lusk. "The boys are getting excited about the season."

Ray Stanley, a 155-pounder from Taylor Center, was named the meet's outstanding wrestler for pinning four of his opponents in a total time of 12 minutes.

During the 13 finals matches there were only two pins.

PLYMOUTH CANTON'S eighth place finish was only one-half point out of seventh place.

"I was really happy with our performance," said coach Dan Chrenko. "Even though eight doesn't sound like much, it was better than last year's 12th place finish. This is a tough meet."

"We got off to kind of a slow start in the first round but we were competitive all day. We kept scrapping and were in sixth place most of the time."

"We got four kids into the finals. When that happens you're with the best of them."

Chief captain Bill Heedum lost his first match of the season with a 5-0 loss to a tough Edsel Ford opponent in the championship match of the 105-weight class. Heedum still took home a medal for the runners-up spot and holds a 10-1 mark this year.

Kyle Heaton surprised a lot of people in the 155 competition, also finishing with a second place medal. Heaton was pinned in the championship round by the Taylor Cen-

ter grappler who was named the outstanding wrestler of the Invitational.

Chuck Walker was third in the heavyweight division. One of Walker's three victories came against the Bentley grappler who beat him earlier this season.

"Chuck's going to hold his own his year," Chrenko said. "He's starting to gain confidence."

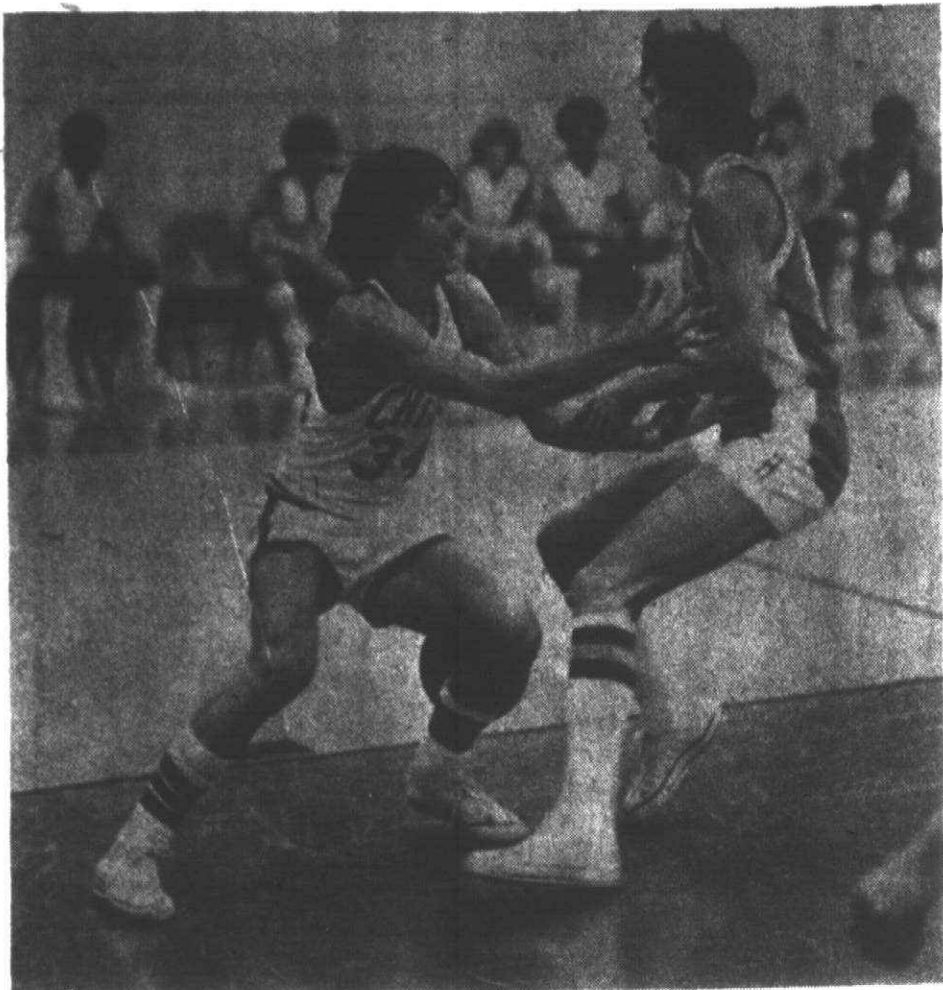

Stanwood places 3d

Junior Marion Stanwood represented Plymouth Salem's girl swim team with a third place finish in the 200 freestyle race at the state meet held at Central Michigan University in Mt. Pleasant last Saturday.

Coach Chuck Olson was pleased with Marion's performance in the 200 free.

"That time (1:58.2) was almost two seconds better than she's swam," he said. "All our swimmers improved at the state meet."

The Rocks were undefeated Suburban Eight League champions this past fall and lost only one dual meet all season.

Plymouth Canton did not qualify any swimmers for the state meet this season.

Harris leads way

Improving Chiefs show swim promise

Improvement has been the steady nature of the Plymouth Canton swimming program, and that pattern is anticipated to continue through the coming season.

Coach William Faunce points to several all-around swimmers and a pair of seniors who are definite threats on the state level to carry the load in what could be a very satisfying year.

Senior Kevin Harris' strong suit is in the 100 and 200-yard freestyle events. He finished 14th in the 100 during the state finals last year. "He's our MVP swimmer. He can dominate the middle distance freestyle races, but could be respectable in any event he enters," said Faunce.

The second best overall swimmer for the Chiefs is sophomore Dave Tanner, who is expected to make many contributions once he recovers from an injury that gave him 17 stitches in his foot. The 200-yard individual medley is Tanner's bread 'n butter, and he can push Harris in the freestyle races.

The Chiefs will have to do without their number-one backstrokers for the first couple meets because of another unfortunate accident. Mark Reiting was the victim of a bus accident which required several stitches in his chin, sidelining him enough to throw his training schedule off.

"It takes awhile for these kids to get back into condition after being out of the water for so long. It's almost-like they have to start all over again because you can't swim with stitches," said Faunce.

Scott Wales and Scott Gray give the Chiefs a one-two combo in the diving event that is unmatched in Observerland.

Wales was on his way to a tremendous season last year, when he was plagued by a back injury. This season he's in good health and figure to contend for a berth in the state final, according to Faunce.

"Wales is the best diver in Observerland and will really be making a run for a state

berth. Gray started diving competitively last winter and has really progressed," said Faunce.

Jamie Greenwood will be the team's sprint specialist. Greenwood, a senior, will go all out in the 50 and 100-yard freestyle events. Junior Steve Wood leads the butterfly contingent by holding the current school record in that event. Wood posted a 57.7 clocking in the butterfly which makes him a top prospect for league honors this year.

Terry Sullivan will pick up the slack in what Faunce terms as "our weakest event," the breaststroke.

The supporting cast on a swim team can be just as vital to achieving success as the forerunners on the team. And the Chiefs will rely upon their depth to round off a balanced team performance.

Senior Mike McCourt provides the "inspiration" to his team with his fierce determination in the 500-yard freestyle. Sophomores Mike Gaab, Bob Klein and Tom Simrak compliment the talents of the team leaders.

Canton has 13 lettermen competing from last year, with a total of 34 swimmers on the squad this year. "This year is the biggest turnout we've had since I've been coach, and we also have the largest frosh turnout with 14 ninth graders on the team," said Faunce.

Faunce said that this year's team will make a run for second place in Western Six League, trying to improve on a third place finish last year. "Northville looks strong once again and is a good bet to repeat as league champs. But Farmington Harrison has lost many key swimmers and that's where we come into the picture," said Faunce.

Canton opens its season against Wall Lake Western on the road beginning at 4 p.m. Saturday the Chiefs compete in the Redford Union Relays held at RU High School.

Tickets will be available at the door. Price is \$1 for students and \$1.50 for adults.

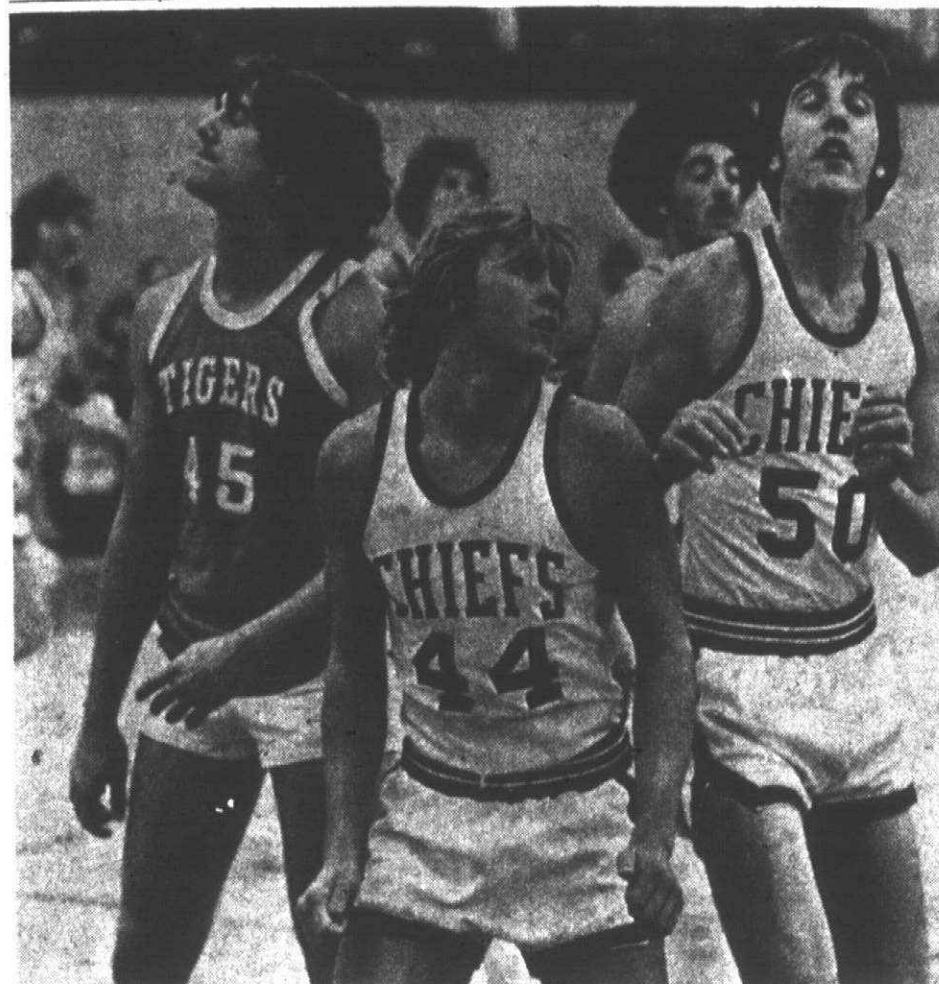
RU is located at 17711 Kinloch, four blocks west of Beech Daly between Six and Seven Mile.

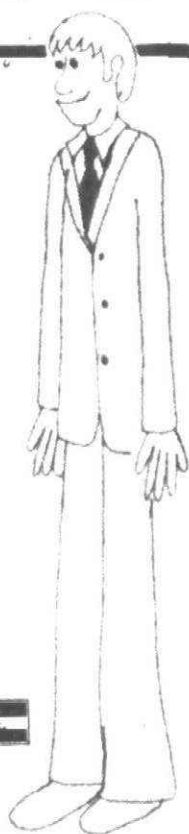

East Lansing grabs crown

Stevenson swimmers edged

Giving their best effort but still coming up a bit short, Livonia Stevenson girls finished second for the second consecutive year at the Class A state swimming and diving championships last weekend.

Eight Spartans qualified combined to shatter five state records in winning five of the 11 events. Stevenson totalled 141 points, 29 behind defending champion East Lansing.

Birmingham Groves was a close third with 138 points and Ann Arbor Pioneer finished fourth with 134 points.

The Spartans, who have been an area and state powerhouse the past two seasons under the guidance of coach Lois McDonald, led all the way until the last event of the finals—the freestyle relay.

However, because the Stevenson quartet of Pixie Smith, Lori Tobis, Jackie Sieh and Nancy Walker qualified only for the consolation finals and East Lansing had turned in the best time of all in the preliminaries, it became obvious that the Spartans could be only second best.

McDonald, however, had nothing but praise for the effort turned in by the freestyle foursome. "We weren't as fast as the others, but we did the best we could," the coach said. "The kids didn't give up. They had their best splits. We have stroke strength rather than freestyle strength."

Indeed, the performance of Stevenson's individual competitors was nothing short of amazing.

Carol Eggers, a senior and three-year let-

ter-winner, successfully defended both her 50-yard freestyle and 100-yard backstroke titles for the second year in a row.

She did it in fine fashion, too, setting new state records in both events. Her clocking of 24.79 seconds in the freestyle sprint broke her previous state record by 23 of a second.

Eggers cruised through the backstroke in 59.81 seconds to become the first high school girl swimmer ever to break the one minute barrier. She also owned the previous state record of one minute flat.

"Eggers had a fantastic career," bubbled McDonald. "She's the first girl ever to be a double state champ three years in a row. Her time in the backstroke was fantastic and automatically qualified for all-America."

Linda Hein, only a junior, also showed her mettle by claiming a pair of individual titles. Like Eggers, both of her wins established new state prep records.

Hein defended her 100-yard butterfly championship with a time of 58.72 seconds, almost two full seconds under her previous record set in last year's meet. The junior also bested the pack in the 200-yard individual medley.

Her effort in that event of 2:14.50 clipped 46 of a second off the previous best girls' mark in Michigan.

"I don't think anyone will touch Eggers' backstroke time and Hein's fly time for a long time to come," McDonald said.

As if their individual exploits were not enough, Eggers and Hein also had a hand in the Spartans' fifth record-breaking per-

formance of the meet—the medley relay.

With Eggers swimming the backstroke, Hein the butterfly, Becky Stanley the breaststroke and Tobis the freestyle, the Stevenson crew qualified for all-America honors by knifing through the waters in 1:53.51.

Other Spartan tankers did their best to complement Eggers and Hein and all showed outstanding efforts. McDonald said.

Pixie Smith placed sixth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:03.13) and 10th in the 200-yard individual medley (2:19.55). "She did a real nice job," McDonald stated, noting that Smith's time in the medley was her best ever.

Laurie Loomis finished ninth in the 100-yard backstroke with a clocking of 1:04.44, the third Spartan to place in the top 10 in that event. "That really helped us," said McDonald.

The word the Stevenson coach most used to describe her charges' efforts at the state finals and the season as a whole was

"fantastic."

"We only had eight girls up there," said McDonald. "They were really a spirited group. We had a good time and I really think the kids did fantastic."

A couple of girls from other area teams also placed high in the state finals.

Marion Stanwood, from Plymouth Salem, finished third in the 200-yard freestyle with a time of 1:58.2. She set a new school record with the effort. "That was about two seconds faster than she usually swims," said Salem coach Chuck Olson.

Cindy Brown and Vicki Brown, sisters from Livonia Bentley, finished third and seventh, respectively, in the 200-yard individual medley. Vicki also placed second in the 100-yard breaststroke and Cindy third in the 100-yard butterfly.

Rena Cox, a Livonia Churchill standout, finished seventh in the 100-yard backstroke.

Marsha Hartley, who placed 12th in the breaststroke, was Clarenceville's best finisher in the Class B finals at Western Michigan University.

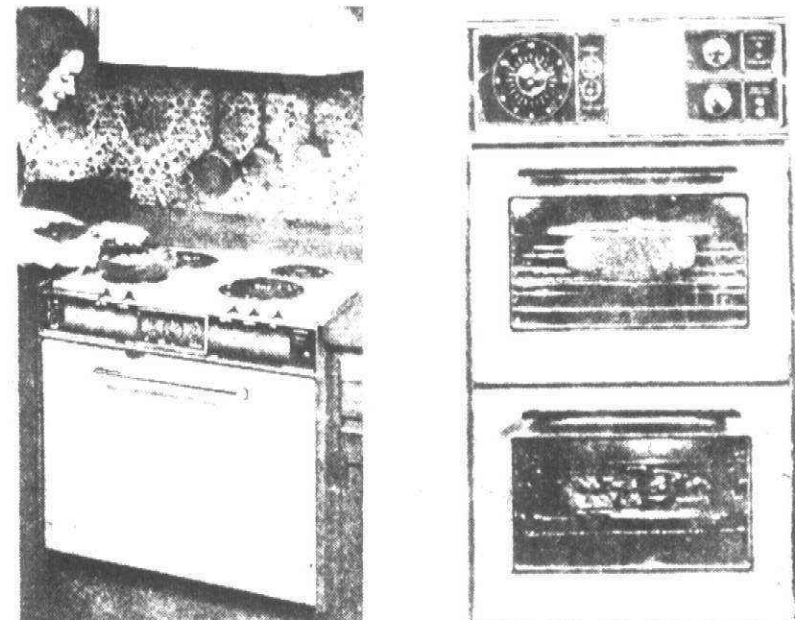

Rose Bowl runners highlight big game

Many things can happen between now and New Year's Day, but from this far away outpost, when the University of Michigan football team lines up against Southern California in the Rose Bowl, the eyes of the multitude will be on two players—Bob Lyle, of the Wolverines and Ricky Bell of the Trojans.

Seldom in this most prestigious of all bowl games have two players—one from each side—attracted the attention that this pair has during the regular season.

Until the game with Ohio State, few fans around the country had the opportunity to see Lyle in action. But when he tore the Buckeye line apart to gain 165 yards and break all Michigan records, the millions who watched him on television were certain they were looking at a great back.

Ironically, shortly after the Maize and Blue had conquered the Scarlet and Gray of Ohio State, the USC-UCLA game was shown on the screen. The same audience that watched the Wolverines then saw Bell, another powerful runner, pile up yardage to get his team into the Rose Bowl.

"What a battle that will be when those two meet" was the reaction of the fans. Even the most ardent followers of the Maize and Blue visualize a great duel between the two ground gaining giants.

What kind of a game will Coach "Bo" Schembechler design for the Wolverines in the bowl?

This question is being bandied about and, while "Bo" called only four passes against Ohio State, there is the feeling that he will have to open up to give Lyle the chance to break away and show his speed.

Much of the success of the team in the Rose encounter will depend on Rick Leach's ability to pass. He'll have to come through to give the attack the diversification it needs to keep the Trojans off balance. He attempted only four against Ohio and they were nothing to write home about. So, much will depend on him.

The Michigan defense can be relied upon to give battle to the Trojans. But, in the main, from this distance, it looks like a duel between Lyle and Bell. And what a battle it should be.

Plymouth Symphony stages Christmas opera

A one-act opera that ranks with "The Night Before Christmas" as America's most important contribution to the holiday season will return to the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra stage at 4 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 12.

A non-traditional tradition will once again return to the Raven Gallery in Southfield this Sunday at 2 p.m. to help usher in the spirit of the Christmas season.

The Focus HOPE Christmas Folk Festival—Opus 8, in its eighth consecutive year, will feature the music of song writer and singer Mike Smith and his wife, singer Barbara Barrow, Dean Rutledge, Sharon Archambeau, Mary Foley, Phil Marcus Esser, Josh White Jr., David Reske, Buffo the clown, Ron Coden, and Lori Jacobs. Also appearing will be Opus 4.

Assisting with introductions will be all-around emcee, media personality Bob Hynes. All proceeds from the program will go to Focus HOPE, a Metropolitan Detroit

organization working to build brotherhood and to eradicate racism. Entertainers are donating their time and energies.

MIKE SMITH and Barbara Barrow have been called the "musical quintessence of the folk scene." Smith's original compositions are a testimony to his talent as many performers incorporate his music into their own shows. Barrow's singing caresses and delights the ears. Recently, the couple has been playing Chicago-area clubs, and will return to the Raven the first two weeks of January.

Dean Rutledge is a familiar name to Ob-serversland residents. Rutledge has appeared many times at Mr. Mike's in Westland.

A veteran of many years in the entertainment business, his music includes contemporary topical songs, comedy and traditional ballads and his own original work. Rutledge has played some fine clubs, and has appeared with Bud and Travis, Odette, Peter Nero, Peter, Paul and Mary, and was a member of the New Christy Minstrels and the New Kingston Trio.

JOSH WHITE JR. is one of the best known folk performers around. He has played the Raven many times, including a few sell-out performances there. White has played many colleges and his third album is scheduled for release early in 1977.

Lori Jacobs is a songwriter and singer in the tradition of Carole King, Joni Mitchell and Kris Kristofferson. Two of the more prominent clubs in which she has performed are New York's Bitter End and Pasadena's Ice House.

Mary Foley, who is relatively new to the Detroit folk scene, has appeared at Vernies, Union Street, the Railroad Crossing, and the Raven.

SHARON ARCHAMBEAU will make her first appearance at a Focus:HOPE Christmas Concert. "Shar" combines the voices

of Janis Joplin, Gracie Slick, Tina Turner, and other throaty modern-day torchers, to create her own very dominant stage presence. She has played the Inn Between, the Olde World, and the Railroad Crossing. Her music is a combination of folk, country, a little blues, a few ballads, and an amazing version of "Amazing Grace."

Buffo is a clown, sometimes happy, sometimes sad, and is a favorite among many. He has appeared on Merv Griffin's show, in numerous Detroit clubs and various college campuses.

Phil Marcus Esser, who is currently appearing weekends in the Colonial Lounge in Livonia, and can be heard at various times on WDET, is another established presence in the folk singing world. He was the director, and a performer, for Detroit Dinner Theatre productions of "Jacques Brel is Alive and Well and Living in Paris," "Personals" and his own one-man show, "Scorpio Scorpio." He also will be appearing in a new dinner theater production of "I do, I do," scheduled for January.

David Reske, who is perhaps better known among performers than metro-area audiences, will be on hand to deliver some of his own material.

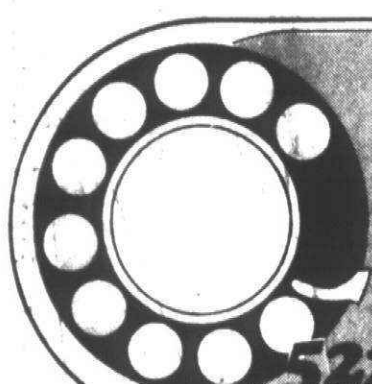
