Grow group for women is flexible

Two members of the Plymouth Family Service staff have broadened its existing programs to include a "growth group" for women living or working in Plymouth or Plymouth Township.

The program will be the first of its kind for Family Service. Social work staffers Mary Schuman and Barbara Lynch are not sure what kind of response they will get.

"We want to be flexible," said Ms. Schuman. "I see it as a group open to women of all different life styles, and I see myself as a member, not necessarily a leader. Barb feels the same way."

BECAUSE THERE ARE so many highly-charged emotional reactions to women's liberation, Ms. Schuman is careful to avoid the use of the label.

"In terms of this group, I tend to move away from feminism and consciousness-raising," she commented. "I prefer to use the term personal growth."

"The general purpose of the sessions will be to help women get a better idea of their values and their roles in society."

She added that many women are finding themselves in the position of having to big large decisions, and she thinks they need support.

"There are women who are divorced or separated from their husbands and are faced with the problem of raising a family," she stated. "A group like ours would provide them with a place to talk about their concerns."

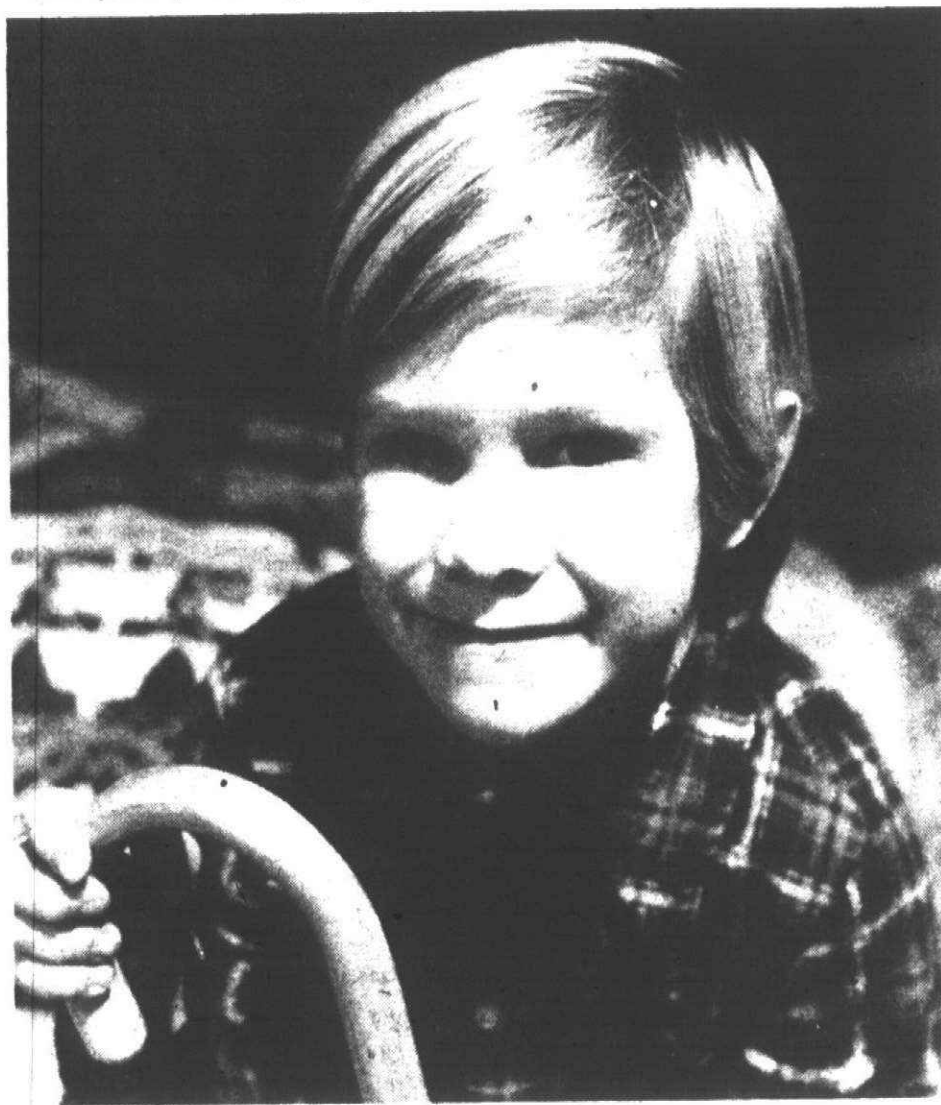
She stressed the group also would be open to married women. She pointed out that many housewives who spend much of their time alone get frustrated and bored and need someone to talk to about the feelings they have.

The sessions will begin on Jan. 11 and will run for eight weeks. The cost is \$2 per meeting. Women interested in becoming members of the group can call 453-0890 for more information.

Canton's growth worries schools

Close cooperation between Canton Township and the Plymouth Community Schools was pledged by board members from both units at a meeting Wednesday evening.

Discussion at the Board of Education office covered a wide range of topics, including projections for growth, location of school sites, recreation, summer tax collection, and preservation of historical one-room schools.

Representatives from the school district and the township explained their present projects for planning and predicting the population increase in the area. The importance of sewers to industrial and commercial development, as well as residential building, was stressed.

NEITHER THE TOWNSHIP nor the schools have completed studies to give an exact picture of what to expect in numbers of school children in the next two to five years. But they expect rapid growth to continue accompanied by the need for construction of additional school buildings.

A brief review of the location of present school property and its appropriateness for elementary or middle schools told of the need for some changes in planned locations.

Schools must be easily accessible for construction and students while maintaining safety and a neighborhood identity, according to school officials.

"We'll cooperate with you. All our information on planning will be available to you," said Canton Township Supervisor Harold Stein.

"We'll get school input very early in

case there's need for a school site," added John Flodin, township clerk.

The impact of population growth on the schools, which overloads facilities, was pointed out by George Lawton, school board trustee. He noted, however, that schools benefit from industrial and commercial developments through additional tax base.

"Canton must build for quality of life," Lawton said.

Canton board members listened to suggestions by school officials that substantial savings in interest payments could be achieved by twice-yearly tax collections by the township.

The present tax collection in December forces the schools to operate for nearly half the year on borrowed funds until local tax revenues are received.

In the areas of recreation and preservation of historical sites, the schools and township representatives also agreed to exchange information and ideas.

Present at the meeting, in addition to Stein and Flodin, were Anne Bradley, township treasurer, and Trustees Eugene Daley, Lynne Goldsmith and Brian Schwall.

School Board President Joe Gray participated as well as Trustees Lawton, Yack, Marcia Borowski, and Flossie Tonda.

School administrators in attendance were Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business; Florence Beier, administrative assistant for community relations; and Sam Ulsaker, administrative assistant for research and federal projects.

of Trustees, will be financed through a \$3,275 federal block grant.

Daisy executive enters hall of fame

The late Edward C. Hough, formerly of Plymouth, will enter the Sporting Goods Industry Hall of Fame this February as its 42nd member.

Hough (1872-1959), who introduced millions of youngsters to recreational air gun shooting, served as treasurer, vice president and president of Daisy Manufacturing Co., formerly located in Plymouth. Daisy is now a division of Victor Recreation Products Group, Rogers, Ark.

Hough's son, Cass, president of Daisy for 13 years and a member of the Board of Directors of Victor Comptometer Corp., will accept the award for his father at the 48th Annual NSGA Convention in Chicago.

Hough joined the Plymouth Iron Windmill Co.—the predecessor of Daisy in 1889 as a tester and packer of air rifles after graduating from high school. By 1894, air gun sales had become such an important segment of the business that the operation was reorganized as the Daisy Manufacturing Co.

Hough was named treasurer of the company in 1902 and became vice president 13 years later. Following the death of Charles H. Bennett in 1906, Hough was elected president—an office he held until his death in 1959.

When Hough entered the air rifle field, he foresaw the potential of the non-powder gun as a source of recreation for Ameri-

Happy ending!

Good egg nearly loses trees

Christmas 1976: The year they moved Pop's Christmas trees.

This is a Christmas tale involving an unusual old gentleman, his battle with bureaucracy, and a group of good people who joined forces to bring about a happy ending.

Pop Taylor's actions reflect the spirit of Christmas 365 days a year. He is everybody's friend. He offers shelter to the homeless in his house on Starkweather. He makes regular stops at the Plymouth Police station to see if anyone needs a helping hand.

Pop is a deeply religious person, dispensing his love and cheer with a happy generosity.

The story opens with Pop's decision to sell Christmas trees. And he had no place to sell them.

"WE REALLY GOT INTO it at 4:30 p.m. last Friday (Dec. 10)," said Alan Gove, engineer for the City of Plymouth.

"We had been looking for a site, zoned commercial, that Pop could use for his trees.

"Pop called at 4:30 and said the trees were on their way. We called Mrs. Bowles about the property on Starkweather." Gove was referring to the proposed site of the Golden Spike restaurant, across the street from the railroad station.

"Mrs. Bowles said she had no objection but we had better check it out with her attorneys. The attorneys said that although the Bowles had been delinquent in their payments, they had received no official word from the C&O railroad that the Bowles' lease was terminated."

Pop's trees were unloaded on the property. He put up his signs and he was in business.

"On Monday, there was a dialogue between the railroad police and our police department. They said the trees had to be moved from railroad property which had automatically reverted to them when their tenant filed bankruptcy," Gove said.

MEANWHILE, BACK at the C&O, Larry Judd who is trainmaster for the Plymouth area, was trying to do his bit for Pop Taylor and private enterprise.

"It was the liability insurance thing," explained Judd. "If anyone had slipped on the ice over there, their first thought would be to sue the railroad."

"I tried to get a \$1 lease through for him. A lease of liability would take so much time to process, it would be after New Years before it came through. "The word came down that he was trespassing and we had to get him out of there."

Last Friday morning, Pop gave up his battle with bureaucracy.

He painted a big sign: "Free Xmas trees—take one."

"IT WAS TOO MUCH," said Judd. "I ripped that sign down." He admitted to a tear in his eye at Pop's gallant gesture. Then Judd went to work.

By 12:30 p.m. the C&O trucks and workers started to arrive at the lot. They were a saddened group as they began to toss the evergreens onto the trucks.

There were mutters of "Poor old guy, where are we going to put them?" and "The old gent's going to lose everything."

"Are they moving Pop out?" asked a friend who stopped to see what was going on. "I told all my friends to come here for their trees."

"He's just a nice old man who does nice things for everybody."

Pop was not around and no one knew where he was. The consensus seemed to be that they were taking the trees to the corner of Haggerty and Plymouth roads—but they didn't know which corner.

Finally, with two trucks loaded to overflowing, Pop returned, all smiles, wishing everyone a merry Christmas, and completely undaunted.

HE GREETED John Prior of the Chessy System and Alan Gove of City Hall with a big smile—and good news.

"The girls over on the corner said I can move the trees over there," said Pop. "Just move them over by the antique shop on Mill. They had trees there last year."

"The girls" were Lenny Eckhout and Rosebud Trask, proprietors of Old Friend

Menagerie, the resale shop on the corner of Mill and Division.

When Pop and the truckloads of trees arrived, he shed a few sentimental tears over having such good friends.

A hug and reassuring words from Lenny and Rosebud soon had him drying his eyes. "They even asked me to have Christmas dinner with them," he marveled.

By mid-afternoon, Pop was in business again.

Judd drew a big sigh of relief but his smile was rueful. "You know how much it cost to move those 335 Christmas trees? \$1,500."

Then he mused, "I guess it would have been cheaper just to buy the darned trees."

Somewhat, the way it all turned out, when all the turmoil and emotion was over, everyone had the good feeling of sharing in Pop Taylor's enterprise.

It was the kind of thing Pop would do for them—if he could afford it.

Weed-cutting bills are a prickly issue

Canton officials are sifting through complaints of numerous township residents, who are storming township offices with bills for weed-cutting services, that they say, were never rendered.

Ordinance Officer Bruce Phillips says township officials are trying to straighten out the billing mess, which he attributes to a clerical error in billing sheets submitted to the township tax department by Van Cleve Weed Cutting Service.

The weed-cutting assessments, ranging from \$25 to \$80, are appearing on tax bills of numerous township residents. The charges are meant to cover fees paid to Van Cleve last summer.

According to Phillips, the township has contracted Van Cleve to cut weeds on private property in the township.

UNDER THE township's noxious weed ordinance, property owners must cut cer-

tain weeds by June 1, July 1 and Aug. 1. The township sends violation notices to property owners and, after a certain length of time, directs Van Cleve to cut the weeds. Van Cleve bills the township for his services, and the township passes on the cost to property owners in the form of tax assessments.

But, according to Canton Supervisor Harold Stein, numerous residents have been billed for services they did not receive.

"I've received a lot of phone calls about this," the supervisor said. "A lot of people are coming in paying their taxes, but they're paying them under protest. Other people are paying their taxes, but refusing to pay the weed assessment."

"We're in a kind of quandary right now," the supervisor continued. "I feel we do have a problem with this, and we're trying to reconcile it."

At this time, Stein says he has no idea

how or why many residents were billed incorrectly. Township officials, he added, will have to explore possible methods of reimbursing residents.

"I'm not blaming anyone for this right now," he said, "but I have directed Phillips to figure out what happened. His department is responsible for this kind of thing."

W-W schools try for 8-mill renewal Jan. 31

Wayne-Westland School District voters will decide on Jan. 31 whether to approve an eight-mill renewal proposal. The last day to register for this election will be Jan. 3.

If approved, the millage, to be used for

operating expenses, would be levied at the end of 1977 for that year.

The Wayne-Westland Board of Education voted unanimously Monday night to place the proposal on the ballot, and also selected an architect to oversee construction under the recently approved bond issue.

The present millage, which was approved by area voters on Feb. 11, 1974, expires Jan. 1. Dennis O'Neill, deputy superintendent for instruction, believes the renewal is necessary.

"We feel that to maintain present programs, we have to approve this millage," said O'Neill.

Area property owners in the W-W school district are now assessed 29 mills for school operations, according to O'Neill. Last year, a 21-mill renewal was approved by area voters for five years. The eight-mill proposal would be assessed for four years. If approved, the total operating millage will come up in another four years, according to O'Neill.

"Once this passes, we can finally have one election for all of the millage. We'll be able to forget about millage elections for four years and concentrate on other things in the school district," said O'Neill.

The last millage increase was passed in 1968 and O'Neill is optimistic that the voters will renew the expiring millage.

"The administration at one point discussed an increase, but with the economy in its present shape and other areas voting down tax increases, we decided to keep the millage (request) at eight mills. I certainly hope that the people will pass it," said O'Neill.

The average house in the Wayne-Westland area is valued at \$26,000 to \$30,000 on the open market and is assessed one-half of its value or \$13,000 to \$15,000 according to O'Neill.

Under the millage proposal, funds from the millage would be used for general school operation and would be set at eight mills (\$8 on each \$1,000) or \$104 for property valued at \$13,000.

Before approving the proposal Monday night, Frederick Warmbier, secretary of the board, recommended an amendment to

the proposal to earmark one mill specifically for repairs.

"Rather than reduce the general operating funds, we should have one mill earmarked for repairs. I prefer to work on a pay as you go basis," said Warmbier.

Timothy Dyer, superintendent of schools, however, opposed the amendment for management reasons.

"Earmarked money is extremely rigid in managing. When you have cutbacks there isn't enough flexibility," said Dyer.

Dyer also explained that rapid building

that had gone on in the 1960s would not be a problem in the future and that money spent now is in excess of one mill for maintenance.

More than one mill, \$450,000, is spent every year for capital improvements, according to O'Neill, who concurred with Dyer.

Thomas Barrett, vice-president of the board, suggested the board table Warmbier's amendment for later discussion and the motion passed unanimously.

The Lane, Riebe and Weiland firm was selected by the board as the architect for the bond issue. Supt. Dyer made the recommendation to the board.

Pair nabbed for gun, pot

A Canton man and a Plymouth Township man are being held in Westland City Jail, charged with possession of marijuana and carrying a concealed weapon.

According to a spokesman for the Michigan State Police, Gwyn Don Kerley, 21, of 8749 Brookpark Drive, Canton, and Kirk Edward Mucha, 21, of 11520 Haggerty Road, Plymouth Township, were arrested early Monday morning after a search of their car by state police officers revealed a handgun, and marijuana valued at \$1,500.

Also detained was an Ypsilanti man, a Canton woman and a man from Buffalo, N.Y. However no charges were brought against these three, who were later released.

TROOPER T.W. JACK of the State Police said that on Monday at 1:50 a.m. police officers noticed a 1973 Chevrolet weaving from lane to lane on Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth Township.

They pulled the car over and detected the smell of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle, said Jack. The occupants were ordered outside, and the car was searched.

According to Jack, officers found 15 large, and seven small, bags of marijuana in the trunk. On the front seat they found a brown paper bag containing loose marijuana. A nine millimeter handgun was under the seat, he said.

"To my knowledge that was the largest quantity of marijuana we have ever confiscated in Plymouth Township," said Jack.

Kerley and Mucha were arraigned Monday before 35th District Judge Dunbar Davis. They each pled not guilty on both counts and were ordered held in lieu of \$15,000 bond.

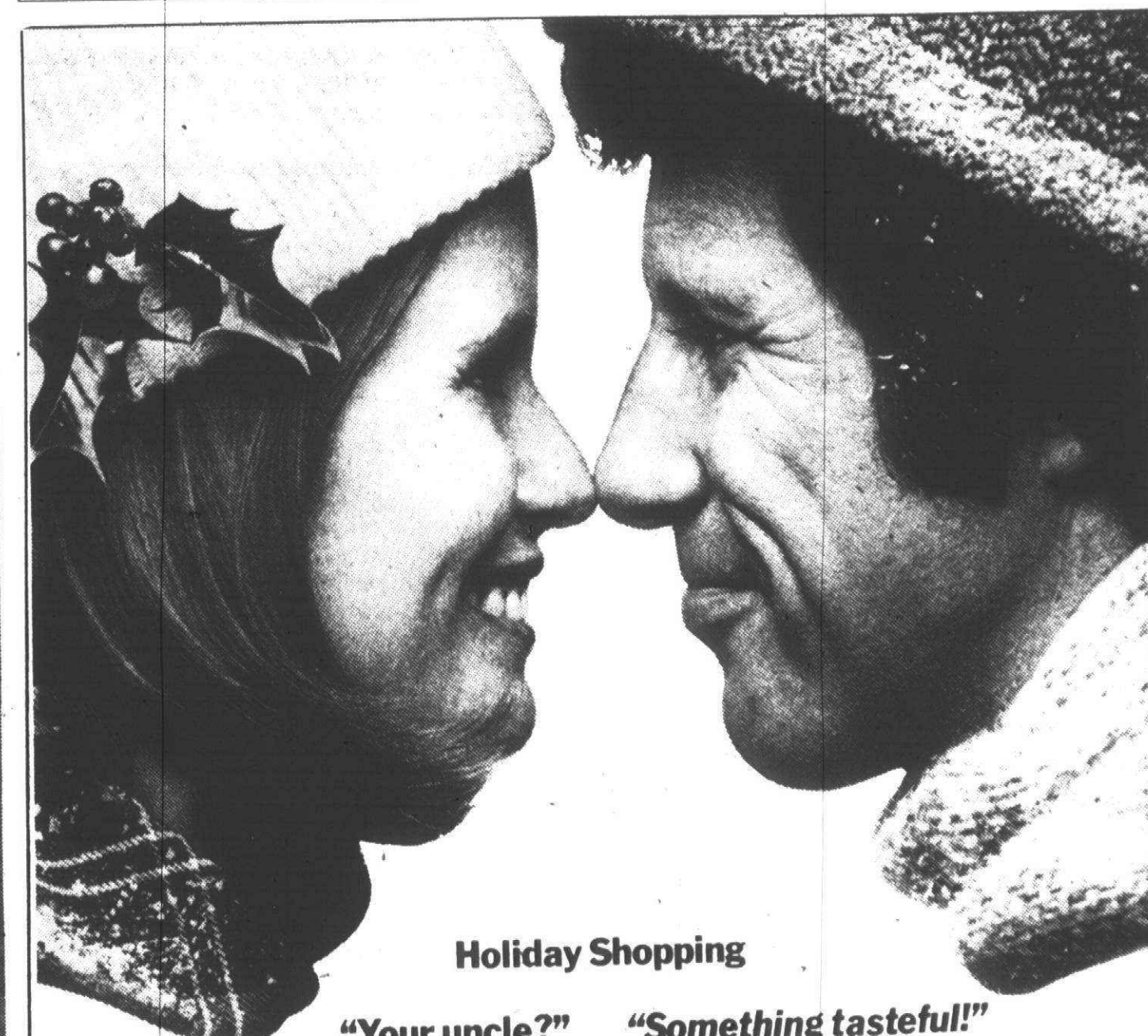

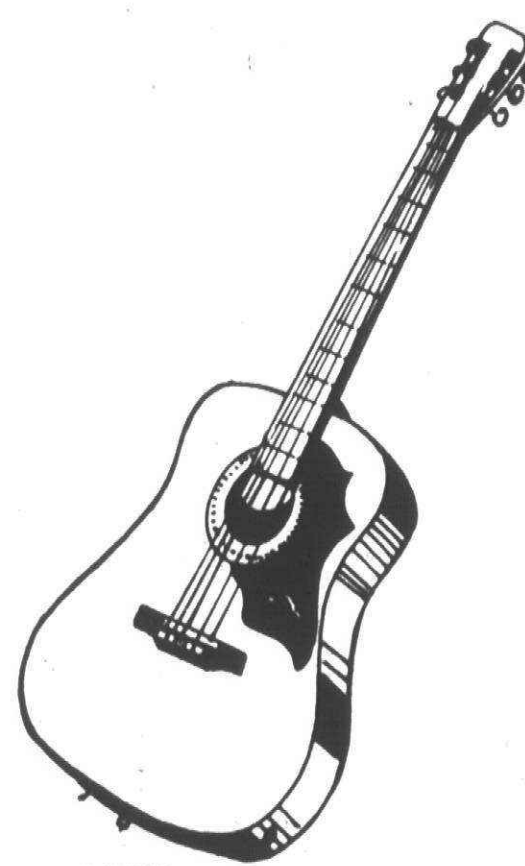
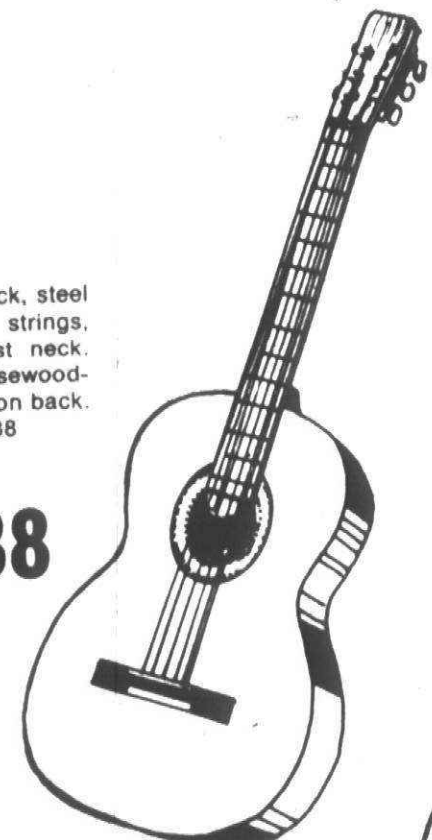

The Wayne-Westland Board of Education Monday night unanimously passed a resolution honoring Michigan's retiring senior senator Philip Hart.

Supt. Timothy Dyer summed up the board's feeling before the formal passing of the resolution.

"This resolution is to honor a man who has been an outstanding public servant for 18 years. He's been called the most honest man by fellow congressmen and he's been a friend of education for a long time," said Dyer.

The resolution was in response to a letter to the board from State Supt. of Instruction Dr. John Porter, according to Dennis O'Neill, deputy superintendent for instruction.

One of Senator Hart's final acts in Congress was aiding education, according to Dyer.

"He was brought from his hospital bed to help override a presidential veto on an education bill," said Dyer.

The specific bill dealt with a \$3 billion act for the Department of Education. Congress overrode the veto, according to O'Neill.

The state superintendent of instruction sent the letter to us and said that Dec. 10-13 would be dates to honor the senator. His birthday was Friday," said O'Neill.

The resolution, which was read by Vincent Petitpre, treasurer of the board, also recognized the senator's leading the fight in developing school lunch programs and college assistance for the underprivileged.

Two young Canton women were recently awarded the Congressman's Medal of Merit for Outstanding Youth of the Bicentennial Era. Presenting the award was Congressman William D. Ford (D-15th District).

Audrey Lynn Hanyi, 17, a senior at Ladywood High School, was given the citation "for her dedication and follow-through attitude in science research, and contribution to humanity and concern for fellow-man."

Ms. Hanyi worked at Wayne County General Hospital Medical Research Department as a volunteer and was able to develop her own science project on liver cells. She later entered and won the grand prize in the Metropolitan Science Fair. She is currently continuing her research.

CARRIE YOUNG, 20, an Eastern Michigan University student received her award "for her active role in stressing the responsibility and privilege of voting and getting out the vote, and restoring citizen participation in the governmental process."

Ms. Young went to approximately 1,500 homes before the August primary, trying to get people to register and be informed about the candidates.

There were 13 winners selected by a citizens committee appointed by Congressman Ford. The committee was made up of representatives from each of the communities in the 15th District.

This committee set the following guidelines for the judging criteria: The accomplishments of the nominee must be meaningful; they should not be based primarily on scholarship, athletic ability or organizational membership, nor should they be something for which the nominee received payment.

"So often," said Congressman Ford, "the activities and accomplishments of our young people go unrewarded. The purpose of this award is to recognize the accomplishments of our young people."

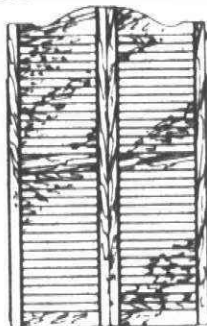

Old Swedish festival marks end of darkness

They could have been in Sweden. Lucia, Queen of Light, entered the room wearing a long, white gown and a glowing crown of candles. Her assistant, also in white, wore a tinsel crown. Lucia carried a tray with a coffee pot, cups and Lucia buns (Lussekatlor).

As they sang of the light and joy of the Christmas season, in the background, a choir sang the words to the familiar Italian tune of Sancta Lucia.

The choir was a recording. But Lucia and her partner were authentic Swedish blondes, both born in the town of Eskilstuna.

Margaret Retting, who lives on Southworth in Plymouth Township, was Lucia. Maryann Garber was her assistant. Mrs. Garber's father, the late Edward Johanson, was Swedish Consul in Detroit.

THE LUCIA FESTIVAL, an ancient custom close to the hearts of Swedes, was the highlight of the Dec. 13 meeting of the Ladies Guild of Lutheran Church of the Risen Christ, Ann Arbor Road at McClumpha.

Maryann Garber was hostess of the gathering in her Danbridge Court home. More than 30 members of the guild saw the reenactment of the Lucia Day ceremony.

And on the same day, in Sweden, Lucia appeared in every cottage and castle. Before dawn, the eldest daughter of each family approached her sleeping parents wearing a long white gown and crown of lighted candles. Each carried steaming coffee and

Lucia buns, and as she walked, she sang the Lucia song. Younger sisters and brothers followed in her wake, wearing white gowns and carrying lighted candles. The girls wore wreaths of tinsel in their hair. The boys wore tall, pointed hats, sprinkled with stars.

Awakened by the lights and the singing, the parents arose, and broke night's fast by eating and drinking the food.

The Christmas season officially was opened.

ROOTS OF THE celebration lie buried in the dim past.

Lucia appears before dawn Dec. 13, the first day after the longest night of the year in Sweden.

In ancient times, her appearance announced the return of the sun as the days grew longer after the winter solstice.

The people were superstitious; darkness was feared. They believed evil ran rampant in the dark but disappeared in daylight.

There was great rejoicing at the appearance of Lussebruden, the bride of light.

Festivals of many types were observed in different parts of the country. Exactly where or when the present form of the celebration developed is unknown.

The old pagan custom of worshipping the sun, the stars, and the light became interwoven with the festivities surrounding the birth of the Christ Child.

The lady with candle crown could have originated in a legend from Varmland. The story is told of a spirit in the form of

a white-robed maiden, wearing a crown of burning candles, who, when the villagers were starving, appeared, bringing food.

WHEN CHRISTIANITY came to Sweden, Italy's St. Lucia became synonymous with Sweden's Lussebruden.

Lucia, a Sicilian maiden, sacrificed her dowry to feed the poor. She was burned at the stake because she was a Christian.

Dressed in purest white, she stood in the flames but was not destroyed. Those who witnessed the sight saw an aura of light above her head.

Having withstood the trial by fire, she died by the sword of the cruel judge who had condemned her to death.

So it has evolved. The Swedish Lucias appear each Dec. 13 to the strains of "Sancta Lucia." The words are Swedish.

Today, the coming of Lucia is directly related to Christmas. From the time she appears, the holiday spirit is evident.

Schools, hospitals, business places and industrial plants all have their own Lucias, and workers willingly come early to be present for the festivities.

Each little town selects one of its beautiful daughters to appear before the council. In Stockholm, the loveliest of all spreads light and charm in the city hall on the shore of Lake Malaren.

"It has almost become a beauty pageant type of thing in some areas," said Mrs. Garber.

In Lucia's honor, contributions are made to institutions serving the blind.

According to the Swedes, "Lucia's coming brings light to a darkened world."



SC offers medical records technology

"It's not quite business, and it's not quite medicine," said Patricia McLane, an instructor in the growing field of medical record technology at Schoolcraft College.

Every time a patient checks into a hospital or other health care facility, a record is prepared. With crowded conditions at most hospitals, these records become extensive, and it is the job of the medical record technician to keep them. While there have always been technicians, Ms. McLane feels the field is growing.

"With the emergence of computers and data processing, there has been tremendous growth in the field in the past few years," she said.

THE TWO-YEAR program offered at Schoolcraft prepares the student for a national certification exam, similar to the program which accredits certified public accountants (CPAs).

"Our program has nothing to do with accounting or money at all," remarked Ms. McLane. "Basically the program is designed for those interested in medicine, not science, and those who don't want to see patients," she said.

The course titles offered sound more like medical courses than business courses. The first course is 101-102 Medical Terminology.

Other courses include: Principles of Medical Record Science, Hospital Research Techniques and Statistics, Coding and Indexing of Diseases and Operation, Medical Record Seminar and on-the-job training courses called Directed Practice.

THE PROGRAM, which leads to an associate in applied science degree, can also be a lead-in for a bachelor's degree at Mercy college.

Ms. McLane, a Redford Township resident who has been teaching at Schoolcraft since 1972, received her bachelor's degree at Mercy and also has a master's degree in the field from Eastern Michigan University. Most of her students do not plan to go on for the bachelor's degree because

Selected are James Houk of Plymouth, Elaine Stinson of Canton Township, Sister Colleen Morris of Livonia and Anthony Marschall of Westland.

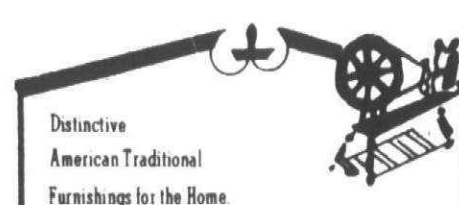
The agency is a non-profit federally funded planning agency that awards federal Title III funds under the Older Americans Act to provide services to senior citizens.

"We thought 10 years would be enough," said Mrs. Shemwell who works at Plymouth Community Federal Credit Union on Harvey Street.

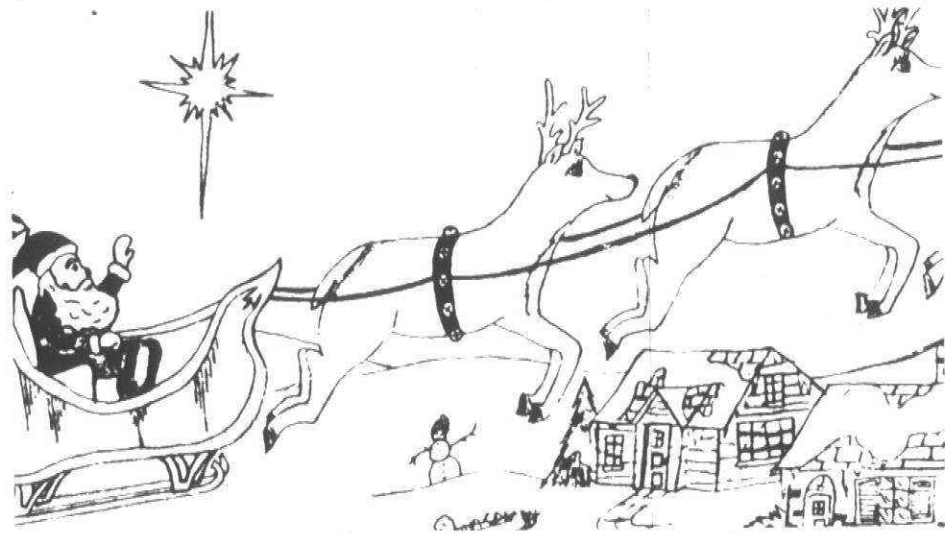
"We were going to call it quits. But several persons mentioned that they were looking forward to our cards. We decided to do one more."

Caroline is seeking women

A massive report on the status and needs of women in all parts of the United States will be put together in the coming year, and feminist leaders like Caroline Bird need help in its implementation.

The report is to be made by the National Committee on the Observance of International Women's Year. Ms. Bird said in her recent visit to Schoolcraft College. She is one of a committee of some 25 volunteer consultants who will help amass information.

"A plan for getting information for the report has been made and is available from the Department of State in Washington," she said, "but action has been delayed because the decision of a federal

judge in Illinois on a motion by anti-ERA leader Phyllis Schlafly."

New legal moves now have given the green light to compile the report, and the plan is for hearings in the various states and territories, including even Samoa, which will culminate in a major session in Houston in November 1977.

A federal appropriation of \$5 million has been made for the project, she added.

"One of the problems we must solve," said Ms. Bird, "is that we have a mandate from Congress to represent all the women of the nation, but we do not have good contacts with all."

"There will be no problem getting information from academic women, women in

various organizations like the American Association of University Women and the League of Women Voters.

"We also can reach women in labor unions quite easily, but we need some better contacts with black women, women in ethnic minorities, women in lower economic strata."

"We need more women who can speak for the minorities."

Those women who can put the committee in touch with such spokesmen or who could help in various ways to compile the report are urged to write to the National Committee on Observance of IWY, Department of State, Room 1004, Washington, 20520.

And a hurry-up project which involved a group of busy people in the Disciples of Christ congregation here will give the old people in the denomination home in Indiana the message that someone wants them to have a happy Christmas.

The story of the ornaments really started a year ago when Glenda Distler, known as one of the "do-everything" people in the local congregation, taught her church friend, Sara Humphery of Plymouth, to knit.

"Glenda gave me some little knitted tree ornaments last year," said Sara, "and I thought they were so beautiful I wanted to learn to knit so I could make some."

Learn to knit she did, and when another Christmas approached she started turning out her own creations, tiny knit stockings, caps, balls, bells.

"Then, last weekend, I found I had 10 extra ornaments, and I thought they might be used in one of the homes our denomination operates for elderly people. Mrs. Humphrey said:

"I CALLED my friend, Dick Lovelace, who's assistant administrator of the Emily Flinn Home for the Aged in Marion. He said yes, he would like to have them for

the residents, and did I have any more than 10. I asked how many, and he said 151 would be enough to go around."

That seemed quite a big order, but Mrs. Humphrey figured she and Miss Distler could manage a couple of dozen, and she promised she'd get them in the mail in time for Christmas.

But then the two friends started thinking they perhaps could do better than that, and they mentioned the project to their pastor, the Rev. William Hass.

All three started calling others in the church to see if they would like to contribute a couple of handcrafted ornaments to brighten Christmas.

Everyone had other names to suggest, and before long a good share of the congregation was involved. To the original knit ornaments were added tinsel angels, stained glass pictures, decorated balls, painted wood figures and slippers made of Christmas cards. Miss Distler and her mother, Nellie Distler, turned out a couple of dozen each.

"We had 300 when we packed them up," Mrs. Humphrey said. "It was just amazing how it snowballed in just 48 hours."

THE ORNAMENTS will be used by Lovelace to decorate the Christmas packages that will be given the elderly residents. For many, there will be only one gift, so the offering of the Livonians will provide an extra Christmas treasure to be pinned on a dress or coat lapel or doorway.

Besides Mrs. Humphrey and the Distlers, the makers included Rev. Hass, Mary Lou Bark, Barbara Schnarr, Jackie Grimes, Nancy McKinley, Bill McKinley, Nancy Zimmerman, Jean Wood, Georgia Bales, Helen Smith, Gwen Jackman, Ron Orr and Nancy Rickard.

Canton matmen pull off upset of the year

The greatest accomplishment in Plymouth Canton wrestling history occurred Thursday night when the Chiefs traveled to Walled Lake Western and upset the perennial league champions 36-29.

Walled Lake had never lost a Western Six League dual meet in its seven-year reign as champion. But it happened Thursday night and oddly enough, at the hands of the newest team in the league.

"It's like a dream come true," said Canton coach Dan Chrenko. "It came down to the last match, and Chuck (Walker) did it."

"This has to be one of the greatest moments in Canton sports history. All our kids were picking people up. Canton fans were on the mat hugging each other. It was just a mob."

"You couldn't believe it. It was unreal. I've never been that overwhelmed. It was like Wide World of Sports."

"We wrestled our best ever," the Canton

mentor said. "It was a super match and a team effort all the way."

"I really don't think they (Western) expected us to kick them. Their fans sat back and were chuckling at the beginning of the meet, but when we left it was quiet."

"We did what we had to do tonight. I'm just happy for the kids. All their work paid off. That's what makes wrestling great."

"I told the kids it would be even all the way. 'It came down to them believing in what they were doing. They all knew they could win before the match.'"

WALKER'S VICTORY in the heavy-weight class proved Canton's confidence. With the score 30-29 in the Chiefs' favor, it came down to that final match and Walker pinned his opponent in 42 seconds.

"Chuck said just before he stepped on the mat that we were going to win and he did it," Chrenko said. "All the kids knew what they had to do and did it."

"Chuck's going to be heard of. He's starting to believe in himself."

What made the Chiefs' victory more unbelievable was that they lost four of the first six matches. Canton's strength going into the season was its lightweights. No one over 165 pounds was on the team except Walker. At one point this year, the Chiefs forfeited the last three weights because they had no one to wrestle in these positions. Against Western the last two weights won by pins.

"We've also developed kids in the middle," Chrenko said. "Western beat our strength tonight."

"I'll tell you, we're 5-1 right now and 1-0 in the league. We're coming."

Canton won seven of the 13 matches, five by pins. Scott Caudwell teamed with Walker for the upper weight victories. Terry Clifton, Scott Collins, and Kyle Heaton were the middle winners.

Senior captain Bill Heedum and junior Mark Bartlett were the old reliables in the lightweights.

The only sad part of the meet for Canton was Craig Lee's rib injury in the 112 match. The junior grappler lost on a third period pin.

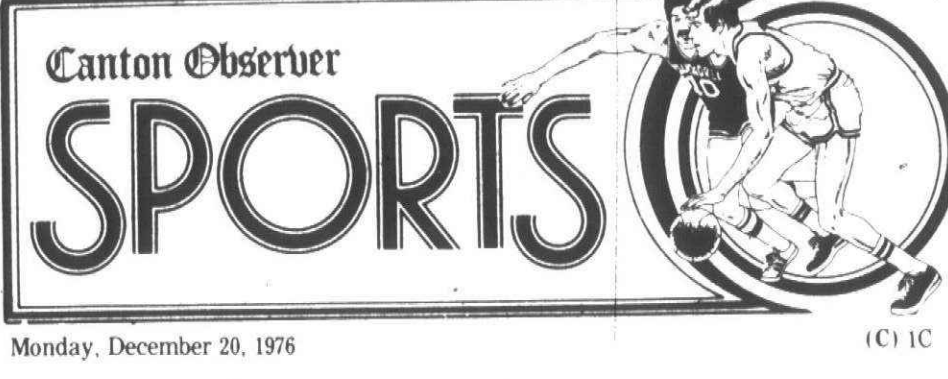

Late pressure plagues Chiefs

For the sixth straight time a Plymouth Canton basketball game went down to the wire Friday night, as the Chiefs saw themselves on the losing end again, 59-58, at the hands of Livonia Churchill.

Coach Casey Cavell's team blew a five-point lead with 1:30 remaining to drop its overall record to 1-5. It marked the sixth time a Canton game has been decided by four points or less.

"We've had enough pressure now so that we should be able to handle it," said a frustrated Cavell. "We never should have lost."

The Chiefs had several chances to win late in the game but failed in each attempt. With 1:30 left, Canton forward Randy Rienas drove to the bucket for an easy lay-up and was fouled for a potential three-point play.

RIENAS MISSED the free throw but the Chiefs led by a seemingly comfortable five-point margin, 57-52. But then, disaster struck. Senior captain and high scorer Rob Mandle fouled out of the game and ignited a string of heroics by Churchill's 6-4 senior Tom Bay.

Mandle's foul sent Bay to the free throw line with a one-on-one situation. He sunk the first and missed the second, but Bay scrambled for his own rebound and put it in to bring the Chargers within two, 57-55.

Churchill then swarmed the Chiefs with a full court press. Bay intercepted the inbound pass and connected to knot the score with 1:04 left. Although Canton blew the five point advantage in 26 seconds, it was by no means out of the game.

After a time-out, the Chiefs brought the ball up court and took their time, waiting for a good shot. But without floor leader Rob Mandle, Canton turned the ball over and Churchill started its fast break down the other end of the floor.

Once again, Bay was at the right place at the right time as he got the ball all alone underneath the basket. Only a foot-ball-like tackle by scrappy guard Doug Smith stopped Bay from scoring, but the foul sent the clutch shooter to the free throw line with another one-on-one opportunity.

WITH ALL the pressure on his shoulders, Bay responded like a cool pro and swished both free throws to put the Chargers on top, 59-57, with 32 seconds left. But the contest was still far from over.

Canton set up its offense and sophomore Butch King missed a short jumper with 15 seconds to go. Bay gobbled the rebound and was fouled with 11 seconds left by Chief Kevin Randazzo.

This time the Churchill ace missed the first of a one-on-one and Canton had new life. Doug Smith grabbed the rebound, drove the length of the court and laid the ball in the hoop to tie the score at 59 with three seconds remaining.

But the officials ruled that Smith was fouled before the act of shooting and nullified his valiant effort. Instead, Smith went to the line with a one-on-one and the fate of the game in his hands.

The gutsy junior converted the first free throw to bring the Chiefs within one, 59-58, but his second attempt fell short and Churchill's John Jameson was immediately fouled after getting the rebound.

JAMESON MISSED the free throw but the clock ran out on the disheartened Chiefs.

Rocks erase 12-point deficit Salem comes back for 5th win

Those two old cronies of this area's high school athletic ramparts are at each other's throats again—meaning Plymouth Salem and Livonia Bentley.

In another basketball zinger, Salem hit the road Friday night to take a come-from-behind decision from Trenton on the downriver court, 55-51. At the same time, in neighboring Allen Park, Bentley was breezing to a 60-28 victory.

Both are 5-0 overall and they are tied for the Suburban Eight lead at 3-0. Sure enough, when loop action resumes after the holidays the first big matchup of the new year will bring a Bentley invasion of Salem on the night of Friday, Jan. 7—a game that could well sell out the spacious Plymouth gym.

Meanwhile, Salem's Rocks will be out to garner their sixth straight victory of the young season tonight when they meet host Livonia Churchill in the opening round of the annual Christmas tournament. Livonia Stevenson and Redford Thurston are paired in the other half of the double header, with the winners meeting for the title Tuesday evening.

RICH HEWLETT, whose professional poise belies his sophomore status, played a sensational game at Trenton—whose Tigers were labeled the Sub 8 "team to beat" in pre-season estimates—as the Rocks overcame a 37-25 halftime deficit with what have come to be typical last-minute heroics.

tinued to wrestle well at 119 with an easy 11-3 win over Edsel Ford's Matt Taylor.

Rick Saunders lost a tough 126 match to Thunderbird co-captain Dan Burke by a 3-0 decision. But Salem's Jim Ross came back to handle Joe Cruz 6-2.

Rock Carl McNulty pinned Mike Meridian, one of Ford's tougher wrestlers, in 4:34.

Fidge's shocking loss followed as Hakiw Fakhoury won a see-saw decision 12-8.

Tom Chiatialis tied Derrick Linton 1-1 at 153. Linton was a third place finisher in the Glenn Invitational.

Matt Wilken started that final Salem string of victories with a 3-2 decision over Frank Iaquinton. Jerry Ottenhoff followed with an 8-2 win over Don Kohlstrand.

Bob Dasher and Dave Champion closed out the night with pins over Sam Vernizano and Larry Guido respectively. Dasher's win came at 4:56 when he was losing. Champion had no problem, finishing the match at 3:14.

This victory marked the final Rock match before the holidays as the squad enters the new year with a 4-2-1 overall record and a 1-1 loop mark.

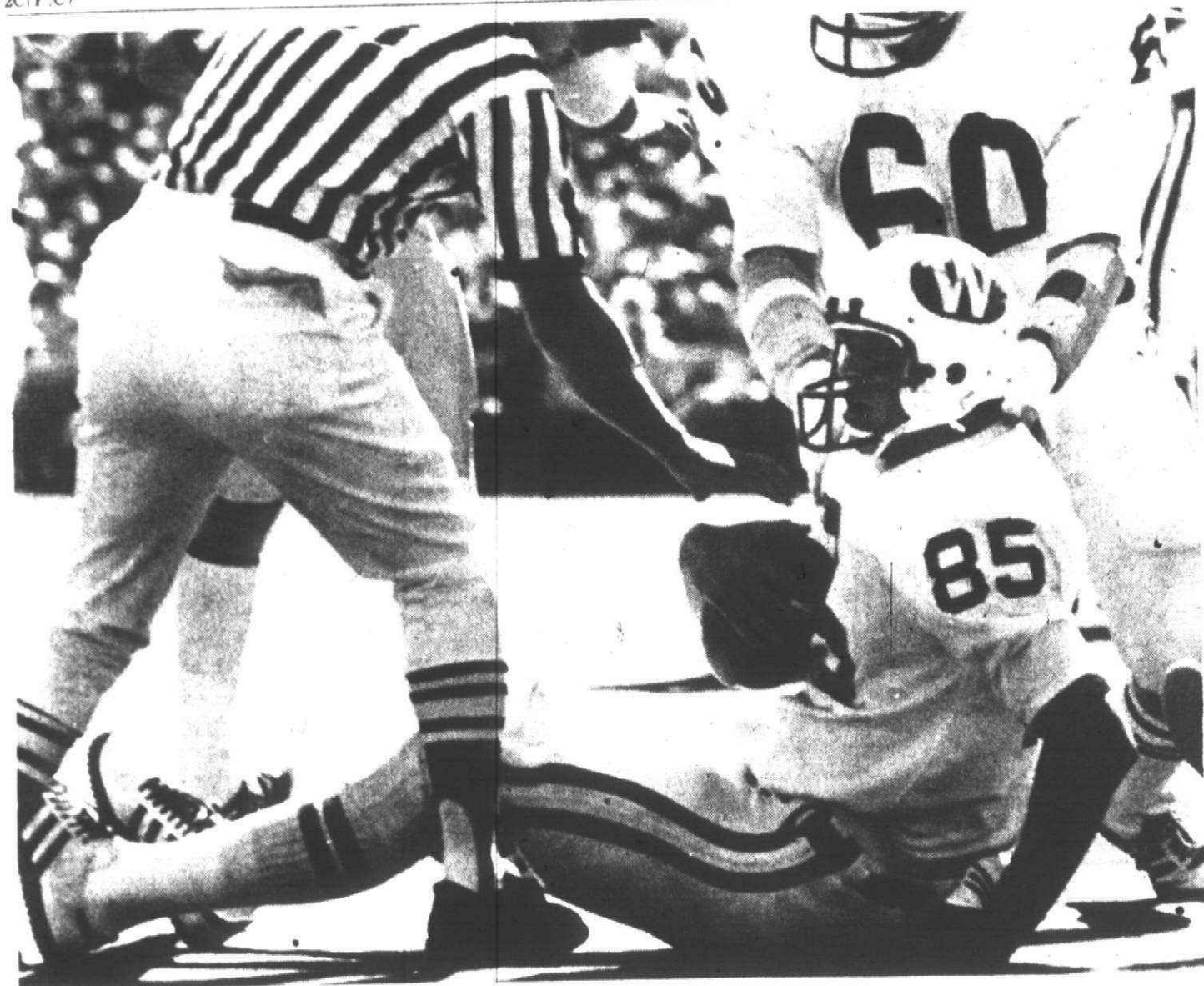

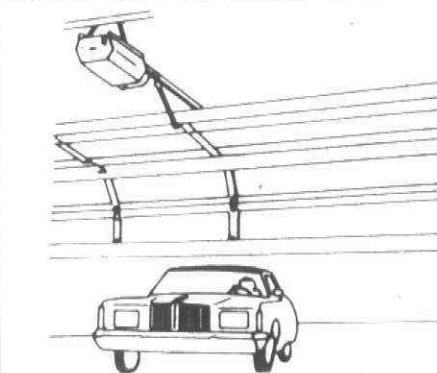

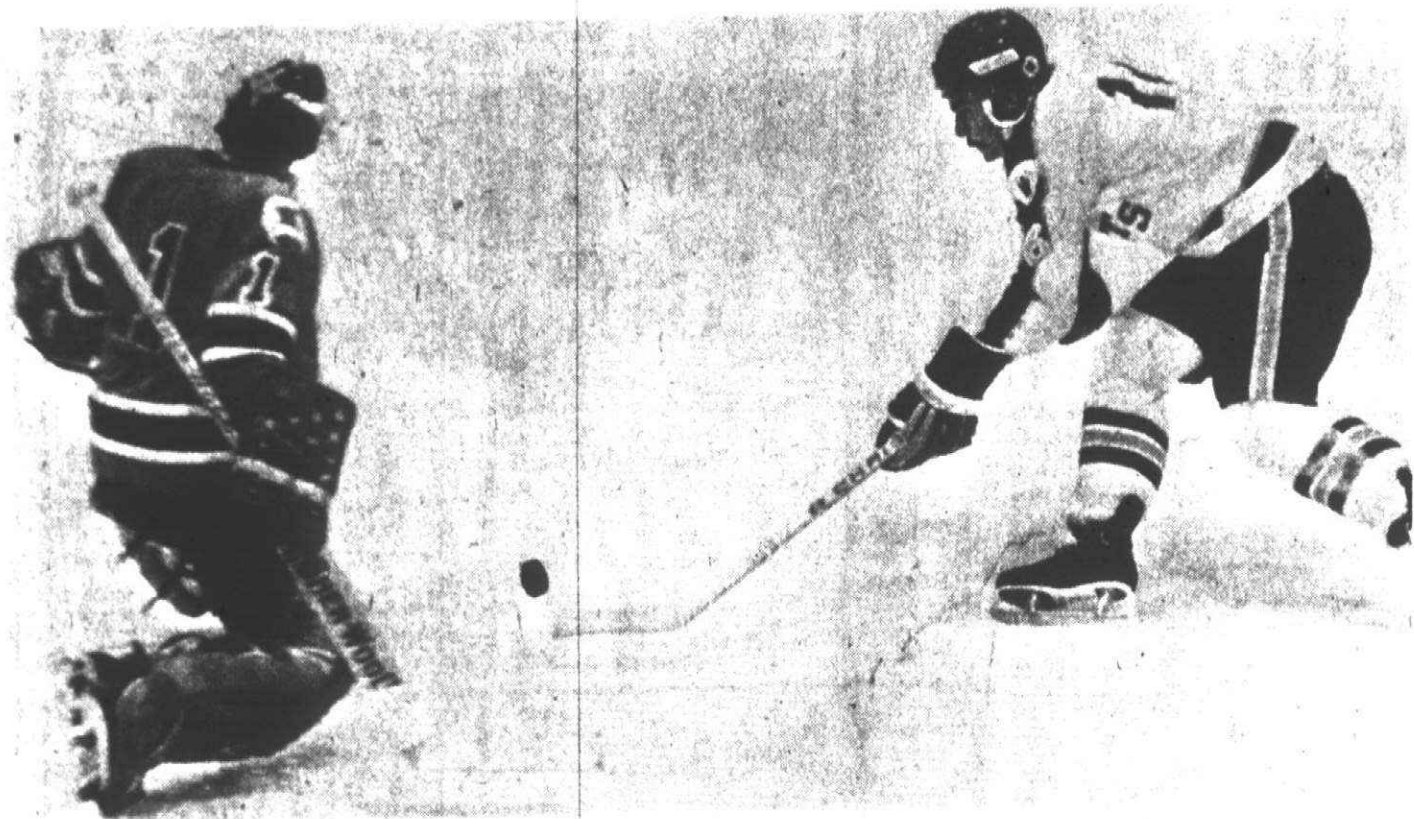

The Rocks have won this tournament for the last two years including four of the five previous battles.

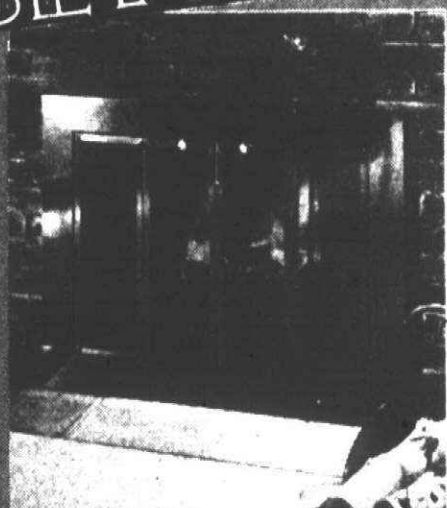

Beware of Mexican bandits, AAA warns

Persons planning a Mexican vacation this winter should choose their activities carefully because of recent attacks on U.S.

citizens in the country, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

"While the vast majority of persons trav-

eling to Mexico will encounter no problems, we are advising tourists to that country about the sharp rise in attacks by bandits robbing and terrorizing American visitors," explained Joseph Ratke, Auto Club touring manager.

"The pattern of these incidents has involved tourists' cars being forced off the road, in each case by some vehicle whose occupants were armed," said Ratke, adding that cars, possessions and money were stolen and the victims left abandoned in the countryside.

Although attacks have been centered in the Mexican state of Sinaloa on the main north-south artery leading to Mazatlan, Guadalajara and Acapulco, one attack occurred near Acapulco.

"Auto Club is not discouraging travelers from going to Mexico, only advising them to plan trips carefully and stay near major population centers since nearly all attacks have occurred in isolated areas," Ratke pointed out.

"Auto Club members should check in at an AAA border office so they can be forewarned of any potential difficulties awaiting them," he added.

Among the things a U.S. citizen should carry is proof of citizenship, usually through a voter's registration card, birth certificate or passport. A driver's license does not constitute proof of citizenship.

Anyone planning to visit the interior of Mexico must obtain a tourist card in advance. U.S. automobile insurance is not valid in Mexico and full coverage must be arranged with a reliable Mexican insurance company. This can be done through AAA border offices and offices of other clubs near the border.

"Tourists should realize that in case of an accident, a motorist and his car are often held whether guilty or not until payment of the damages or claims," Ratke stated. "CB radio equipment also should not be brought into the country since foreign visitors cannot obtain permission to operate such equipment."

"The Mexican government is aware of the recent increase in attacks on tourists and has beefed up patrols, but the problem is Mexico is a big country and much of it is isolated and sparsely populated," Ratke said. "This makes enforcement difficult."

Enlist now for GI Bill benefits, Army cautions

There's still time for high school seniors and others to cash in on GI Bill benefits offered wartime veterans before the military's new educational plan goes into effect Jan. 1.

The new plan would allow a maximum education and training benefit of \$225 per month to a veteran, regardless of the size of his or her family. That may sound good until compared with the minimum of \$292 per month for a single person under the GI Bill.

The difference could amount to \$67 for a single person or up to \$171 for a veteran with two dependents.

To ease the blow for new soldiers, the Army has devised a delayed entry program which allows high school seniors to sign up before Jan. 1, enlist after they graduate and claim full GI Bill benefits when they leave the service.

Those enrolling after Jan. 1 will fall under the new educational plan.

CONGRESS RECENTLY voted an eight per cent cost-of-living adjustment to the old GI Bill. It also approved a nine-month extension of benefits to 45 months of eligibility.

Borrowing limits on educational loans also have been raised from \$600 to \$1,500. Interest rates are comparable to other federally insured education loan programs.

Men and women who entered the armed forces after Jan. 31, 1955 and before Jan. 1, 1977 who served more than 18 months on active duty and who received an honorable discharge are eligible for educational and training program benefits under the old GI Bill.

NEW RECRUITS will have the option of contributing between \$50 and \$75 of their monthly military pay to the educational assistance fund, for a minimum of 12 consecutive months under the new educational plan.

In return, the Veterans Administration will match every dollar that the veteran had contributed with two dollars in federal funds. This money must be used for tuition and expenses in educational or training programs for up to 36 months after leaving the armed services.

SEVERAL PROVISIONS of the new educational plan affect colleges and universities enrolling veterans receiving benefits under the programs.

Institutions will have to publicize and enforce academic performance standards for grades, class attendance and work load, as well as report within 30 days any change in a veteran's academic status.

Schools will also have to restrict the number of veterans and other federal-grant recipients enrolled in every course to 85 per cent of the total.
