PBB isn't in meat, but it's in our bodies

The director of one of the state's busiest private PBB-testing labs says that in the past year his company has found no detectable levels of PBB in meat and milk taken off grocery shelves for testing.

However, Dr. Richard Copeland, chemical analyst at the Ann Arbor office of the Environmental Research Group (ERG), said 80 per cent of all breast milk samples his lab received show definite detectable levels of PBB.

The people of Michigan consumed

95 per cent of the PBB-tainted meat and milk in 1973 and 1974, Copeland said.

The median, (not to be confused with average), level of breast milk samples shows a .07 parts PBB per million parts fat among women who have sent breast milk samples to ERG. The ERG lab is solely authorized by the Michigan Department of Health to conduct official PBB analyses on breast milk.

The absolute lowest level of PBB that can be detected in meat and milk fat is .005, according to Copeland.

REPRESENTATIVES of this newspaper selected the fattest, cheapest pound of hamburger we could find on the shelves of a metropolitan Detroit supermarket to send to ERG for a PBB analysis.

The \$25 test results reported that

matograph. Precision is not adequate at that level. You can see .02, but I can't really feel confident with the reading at that low level."

The lowest level Dr. Copeland would support as a measurable statewide limit for banning the sale of meat and milk is .05 p.p.m.

"That's still six times lower than our present limit of 3 parts per million," Copeland said. "When we're talking about regulatory implications and killing cattle, I'd be more comfortable with a .05 level."

The median, not average, of all human breast milk analyzed at ERG shows .07 parts PBB per million parts fat. So, if the new state PBB limit is put at .05 p.p.m., humans milk from more than one half of the state's mothers technically would be legally unfit for human consumption.

suming low levels of PBB?

"Well, it doesn't have an acute toxic affect," he said. "Some farm people consumed really 'hot' samples of meat and milk that gave them as high as a 7 reading. Some say they have the symptoms of PBB poisoning, others say they're fine."

"Nobody's dropped dead from PBB that we know of. It's not arsenic or cyanide. But it may very well be carcinogenic. That won't show up for 15 years. Nobody knows yet."

PBB was "non-detectable" in our sample, No. AA-10328.

Right now, no meat in Michigan with a positive PBB reading of 3 parts per million (p.p.m.) may be sold. Cattle with a PBB level above 3 p.p.m. must be destroyed.

Copeland opposes a current push in the state legislature to lower the allowable level of PBB to .02 p.p.m. A level that minute, Copeland says, cannot be analyzed precisely and each test varies.

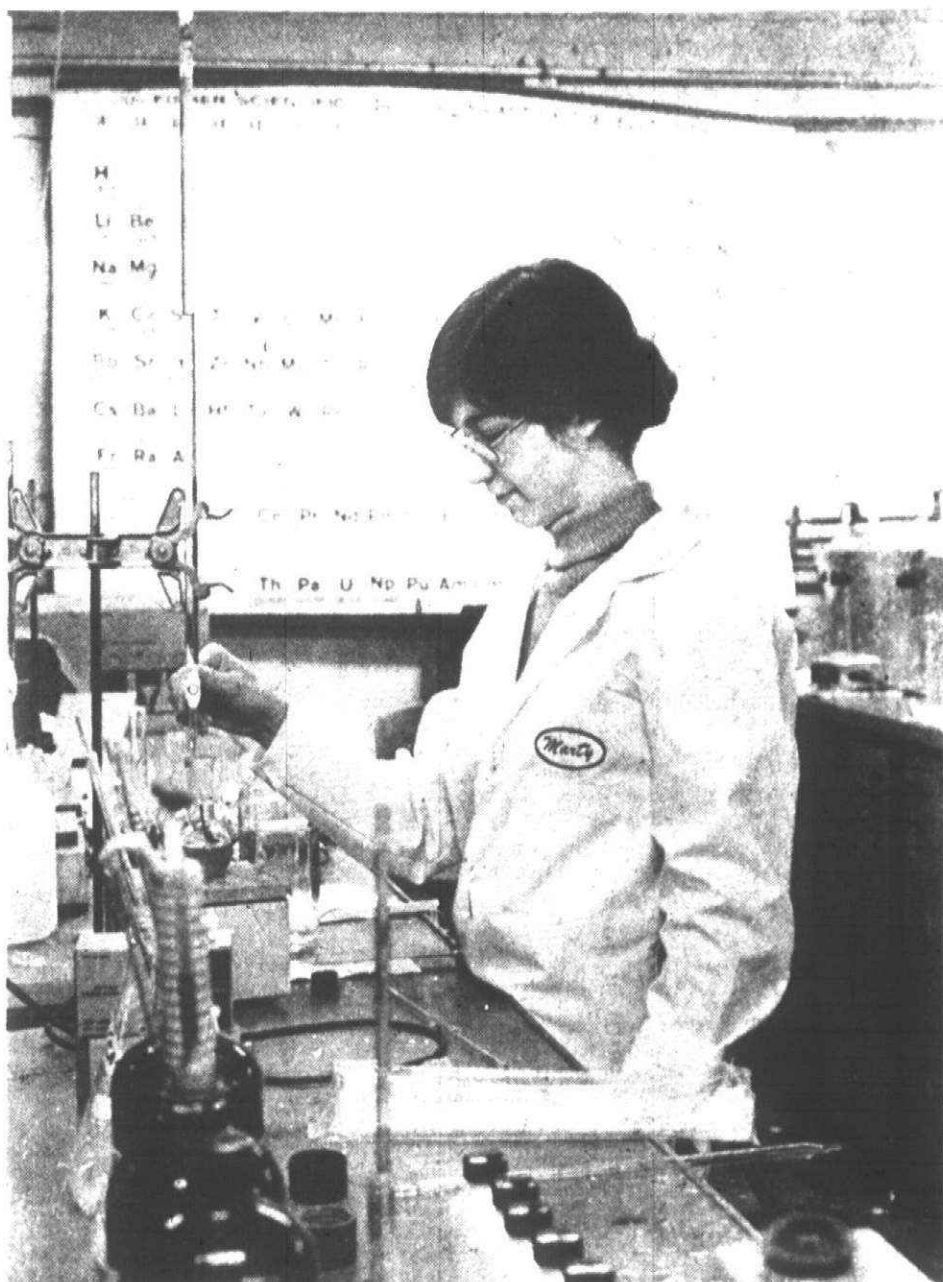
"That .02 level is set by legislators, not scientists," Copeland complained. "I'm concerned about the regulatory effect of the law. You're going to have to shoot that cow if it shows a .21 level of PBB."

"At .02 I can get a blip on the chro-

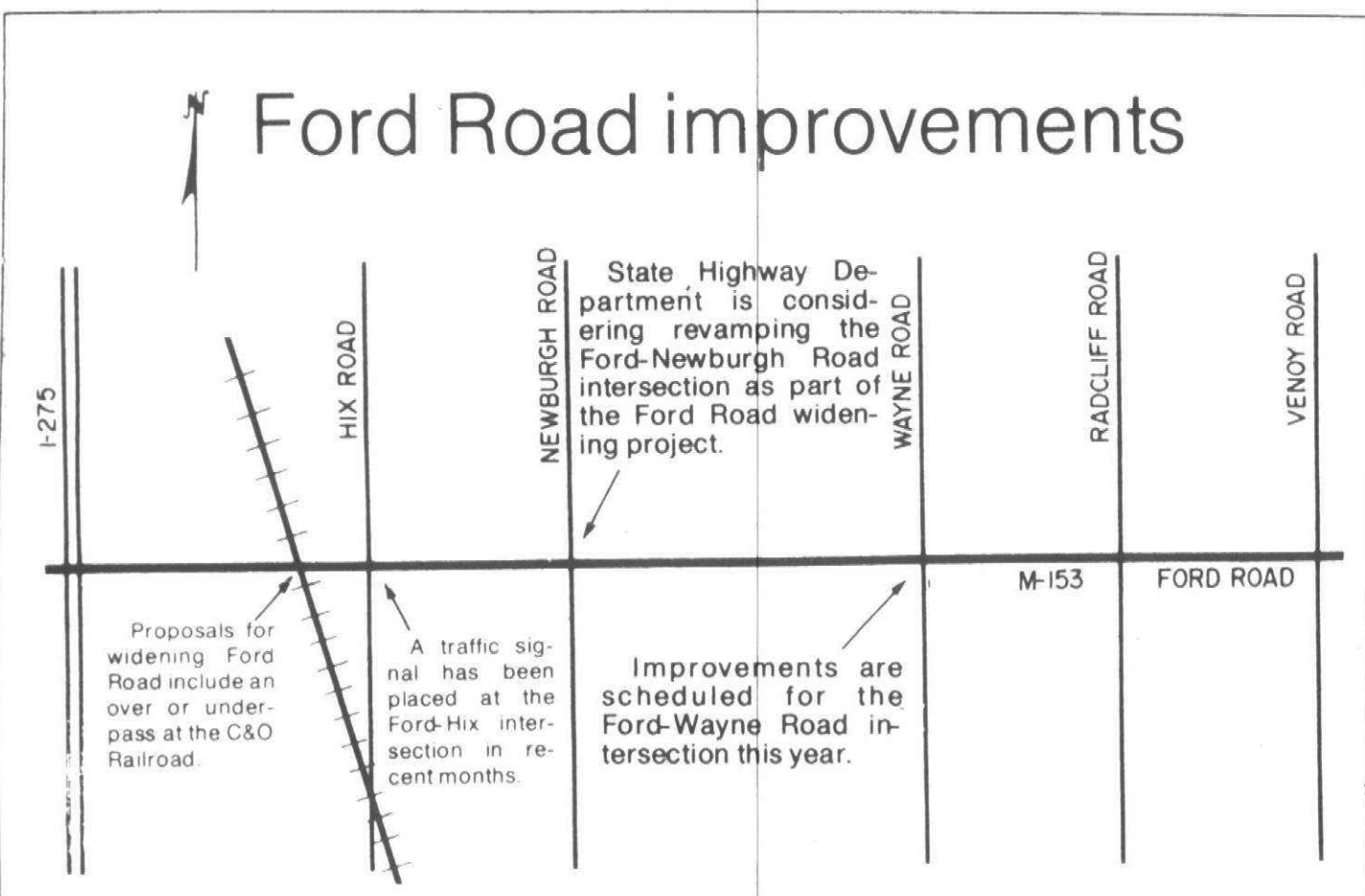
Copeland says consumers have a right to be concerned about contaminated foods, but he feels a consumer boycott of meat now is a case of too much too late.

Overwhelming support for widening Ford Rd.

Preliminary studies for the widening of Ford Road from Venoy to the I-275 interchange were viewed by Westland, Garden City and Canton residents at an informal public meeting in Westland city hall last week.

Highway representatives were on hand from 4 to 8 p.m. with more than 40 persons stopping in for information in the first hour.

Although nothing has been finalized, information as to the possible number of lanes to be added as well as how it might affect homes and businesses along it were explained individually by representatives of the State Highway Department.

Reception of the plans were well received by the majority of persons who dropped in for a look at blue prints and the opportunity to ask questions.

"It is long overdue. It's a matter of civic pride," said Mrs. Richard McNutt of 6221 Newburgh near Ford. "Sometimes we have to give up one thing (land) to get something else," she added.

Clarice Nesbitt, who owns a motel on Ford east of Hix Road, said the widening was "definitely needed."

"I see one of the proposals is for a seven-lane road. I feel five lanes

would be adequate. Something has to be done, though, to handle the increased traffic."

Howard Evans of the Right-of-Way Division of the State Highway Department said he was pleased at the turnout of residents and their apparent acceptance of the proposal.

"In two hours, I have heard no objections from residents, just a lot of interesting questions and suggestions," he said.

Joseph Meszaros, a traffic engineer, explained to one group of residents that 60 feet on each side of the road would be needed for the widening.

"This won't affect too many businesses as there is some right-of-way already accounted for."

"One of the problems might be parking, since once the road is widened, no parking will be allowed on Ford Road. This means businesses are going to have to make other arrangements."

Studies made by the Highway Department estimate that by 1987 between 39,000 and 58,000 vehicles per day will travel Ford Road. The rapid growth of Canton and Plymouth townships, the opening of I-275, as well as the new shopping center at Ford and Canton Center roads, has brought an almost instant boom of traffic to Ford

Road, officials said.

The department presented four alternatives for consideration.

One, that is included in all highway studies, is the "do nothing" approach.

The road would be maintained in its present condition with periodic maintenance to road surface and shoulders to prevent rapid deterioration.

Alternate 2 calls for construction of a new five-lane road with an overpass or underpass constructed at the existing C&O Railroad crossing.

Alternate 3 is a seven-lane road with an additional right-of-way being acquired to accommodate construction.

The fourth alternate calls for a five-lane road, however, turn lanes would be provided at all major intersections to improve movement of traffic. The same amount of right-of-way would be acquired as under Alternate 3.

Meszaros explained that if the proposal for widening be approved, the state would purchase enough property for seven-lanes even if the initial widening is five lanes.

"This would allow us to expand the lanes at a later date without having to go through additional hearings. It

Labor settlement nears as board, union huddle

Hopes for settlement of a teachers' contract heightened at the end of last week with a sudden movement at the bargaining table and the self-imposition of a three-day news blackout by the union to facilitate the possibility of an agreement.

The movement at the bargaining table occurred Tuesday night when Norm Kee, chief negotiator for the school board, raised the possibility of a higher salary offer if the union would agree to counter in other areas of the contract.

The next day, the Plymouth Education Association (PEA) bargaining team suggested tentative agreement had been reached between teams but was vetoed by the school board. An announcement to that effect went out to teachers the same day.

Kee told The Observer Wednesday the school board hadn't voted on anything because tentative agreement hadn't been reached on a contract.

At this point, facilitator Irv Rozian stepped in seeking to calm down the situation to prevent a possible settlement from slipping away. Rozian said agreement was close and the public airing of charges would harm the chances of the Tuesday movement leading to a settlement. Rozian, a Plymouth resident and member of the Michigan Boundary Commission, is working as an impartial facilitator to draw both sides together.

After Rozian stepped in Wednesday, the PEA agreed it wouldn't make any public statement for 24 hours to give Rozian an opportunity to sort out what might have been a misunderstanding. The 24-hour blackout soon extended to a 72-hour blackout, and by Friday optimism remained that a settlement might be close.

THE THREE-HOUR bargaining session Tuesday night did bring the two sides closer together than they've been in a month, if not since the beginning of talks.

The bargaining climate had advanced to the point where by Friday both sides were on call, ready to go back to the bargaining table for marathon talks if it appeared a settlement could be reached.

The school board had met late Friday afternoon for further analysis of its increased salary offer and to discuss with Kee what the PEA could or would give up in return. Union negotiators were awaiting results of the meeting among trustees, Kee and Rozian before deciding whether to return to the table.

The bargaining activity had reached the point where one negotiator confided Friday that tentative agreement on the total contract conceivably could occur over the weekend with ratification to follow this week.

The teachers' union, though, was less optimistic Wednesday that a settlement was near. In fact, the mood seemed to be that a settlement was within reach Tuesday night but had been lost Wednesday morning.

The PEA was under the impression tentative agreement had been reached on salary and the school board Wednesday morning voted to reject that agreement. The union leadership reacted with disappointment because the apparent great leap forward Tuesday night had led to nothing.

Rozian, however, convinced the union leadership Wednesday afternoon that possibly a leap forward had been made and the PEA might have misunderstood the actions of the board that morning.

Kee also believed a misunderstanding had occurred and kept his fingers crossed for three days, hoping against a great leap backward. Kee agreed the movement Tuesday night signaled the possibility of an imminent settlement but stressed the PEA must be willing to negotiate a total package—not just salary.

The school board, Kee said, had been informed there was a willingness by the PEA to accept the latest salary offer. "Basically, the board said that's fine—now go back to the table and see what the PEA will give up in return. There wasn't any vote taken by the school board, nor did the board reject anything. We hadn't reached an agreement at the table, and so there wasn't anything the board could reject."

KEE STRESSED that the entire contract had to be negotiated, and tentative agreement on a single portion of the contract didn't mean the master contract was close to being negotiated.

"We could reach tentative agreement on salary, yet never have a contract. There was a movement Tuesday night. But, in a sense, there is movement occurring every time both sides meet. There are feelings being developed, strategy being employed, and attitudes worked on. But the bargaining procedure must come together on a total package."

"We have made more progress in the last week than we have made in the past month," Kee continued. "I think maybe Tuesday night did signal a move toward a total package agreement."

Because the union had sent out to its members a memo Wednesday stating the board had voted to reject a tentative agreement, Kee responded that same day with a short memo to all teachers. That statement read: "Please be aware that the communication you may have received today from the PEA regarding a proposed settlement of the master agreement is incomplete and misleading in nature. Although progress is being made toward reaching a total agreement, a comprehensive package wasn't developed for a tentative agreement, and wasn't presented to the board of education."

This last-minute jockeying from both sides clouded the picture as to how much actual progress had been made at the table. While the blackout complicated attempts to measure the movement, the blackout also signaled that an agreement was very close.

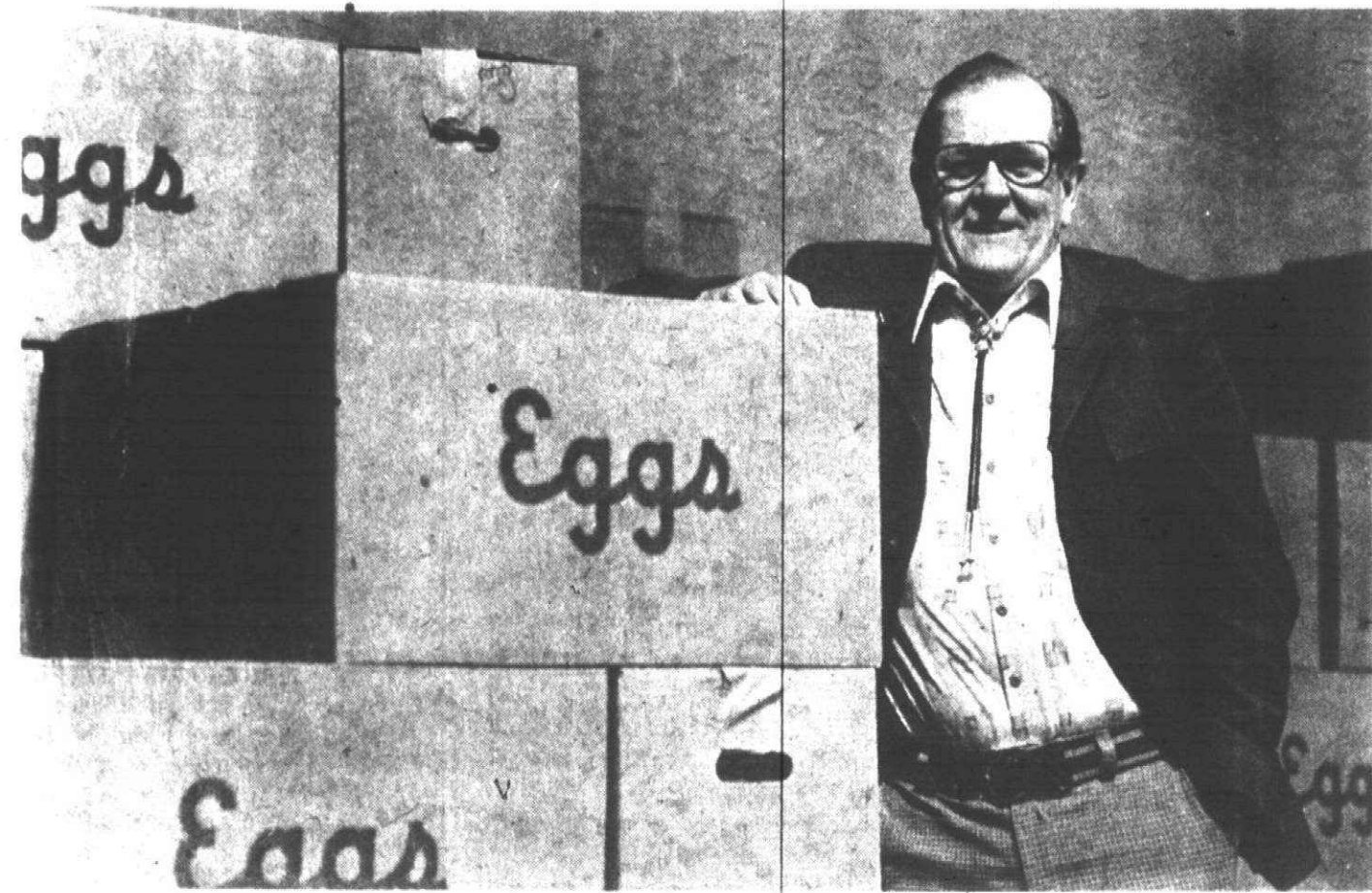

More than 3 million eggs handled weekly by McCully

While the nation's scientists have been sending men to the moon and guiding submarines along the bottom of the sea, the poultry men haven't been standing by idly.

The egg business now has become automated, and in the words of Adam McCully, the big egg man on N. Mill Street in Plymouth, "We grade them, weigh them and even package eggs without a human hand touching them."

And "you haven't seen anything, yet. Wait until the latest machinery arrives. It will be difficult to believe what you see."

Now the owner of three companies (the McCully Company in Plymouth, another McCully Egg Company in Liberty Center, Ohio, and the McClure Company in Grand Rapids), McCully estimates that about 3,240,000 eggs are handled weekly.

"We handle 6,000 cases weekly in our Plymouth station, which means 180,000 dozen or 2,160,000 eggs, and they go out from our Plymouth plant. Most of them are from the Liberty Center branch. Then, we handle about half that number in Grand Rapids to take care of our western and northern Michigan customers."

WHERE DOES the automation come in?

"From the time we receive the eggs from the chicken farmers, they are not touched by human hands, but left

ed by vacuum and placed on conveyors that are lighted sufficiently to allow electronic inspection.

"As the eggs pass over the light, we look for cracks or blood spots, unusual air cells, or watery yokes. They can be spotted in a hurry. One thing we have learned is that the older the egg the larger the cell.

"Once this inspection is completed, the eggs then are graded according to size. You often see the supermarket customers focus on the size because they use a different size for baking and a different size for serving."

Taking time out to explain that he is the only executive in Plymouth who has an office without a desk, he continued the explanation.

"Most people think there are only two sizes — large and small. But we have jumbo, extra-large, large, medium, small and pee wee. We used to call the pee wees the bantam size, but the trade name now is pee wee."

Once the eggs have been given final inspection, they are packaged automatically. He said that few eggs are lost in the process.

"We have come a long way since I started in the business 32 years ago," McCully said as he picked up one of the old-time wooden crates that held only a dozen eggs. "The old timers will remember this. It was a cardboard carton in an wooden box about eight inches square. And you had to return the carrier."

RECALLING HIS start in the egg

business, McCully said he followed in the footsteps of his parents who conducted the egg business on a door-to-door basis in Detroit.

"They used to come all the way out to South Lyon to get the eggs. They'd package them and then make the rounds. In those days, most families on the outskirts raised chickens for two reasons, both economic. First, the eggs were used for baking and for the breakfast menus. Then, for a touch of class, they'd kill off a chicken for Sunday dinner.

"That isn't done any more, or at least, by very few. We get our eggs from the large producers who gather them from all sections of the country, but mostly within 50 miles of their places of business. It would take too long for the small ordinary firm to collect the eggs from the suburban neighborhoods, even if they did raise chickens."

In the distribution of the millions of eggs from the Plymouth warehouse McCully revealed that his company supplies the A&P stores, the Wilson Dairy, the State of Michigan for institutions such as the Northville State Hospital and Hawthorne Center. He also supplies University of Michigan, and all the Clock and Palace restaurants in the area.

"I've been in business 32 years and I am anxious to see what is going to happen next — when the new machinery for further automation arrives."

Plymouth insurance firm's sales up despite state slump

During a period when Michigan experienced considerable unemployment, and the state's economy was lagging, a Plymouth-based insurance company has experienced phenomenal growth.

In fact, the growth has been so rapid that the American Community Mutual Insurance Company in Plymouth is constructing an addition, due to be completed this May, which will increase its office space by 70 per cent.

Most of the growth has been experienced during the past six years, explains E.G. Kohn, director of sales services, although the company has been around for a long time. The firm pioneered health insurance in Michigan in 1938.

The company underwrites insurance for many of the universities and banks in Michigan and has insured Detroit Edison employees for more than 30 years. The company, at 409 Plymouth Road, now has some 1,800 licensed agents.

PART OF THIS growth, says Kohn, has been because of the way banks in Michigan have responded to the firm's programs for creditor life and disability insurance, mortgage life and disability packages.

In 1969, when American introduced these programs, 19 banks signed up. Four years later, 90 banks were using the plan and now more than 130 banks are signed up.

Jack Temple, president of American Community since 1967, attributes the sustained growth to the firm's policy of tailoring programs to fit the needs of clientele.

Temple reports the firm's total income has more than doubled during the past five years—from \$11 million in 1970 to \$25 million in 1975—and by the end of 1976 it will have almost tripled.

Income for the first six months of 1976 increased by more than 30 per cent over the comparable '75 period, with the '76 figure exceeding \$30 million. Net assets have almost tripled in the past five years, from \$6.6 to \$19 million, and life insurance in force has more than tripled from \$143 million in 1970 to \$408 million in 1975.

AFTER AMERICAN pioneered health insurance in 1938, it added life insurance in 1947 and got into mass market insurance in 1962, when Temple joined the company.

In the past five years, declares Temple, American has written more insurance than it did in the previous 32 years of existence. He adds that the idea of wholesaling creditor insurance through banks didn't come to a head at American until 1969.

Besides the creditor insurance, American also writes student insurance in 50 per cent of the school districts in Michigan and in every large college in Michigan and Indiana, including University of Michigan, Michigan State University, Eastern Michigan University, Northern Michigan University, Western Michigan University, Purdue and Indiana universities. The company also specializes in employee benefit programming.

Purpose of committee: To reach common goals

The possibilities of joint efforts on a dial-a-ride transportation program was among the ideas briefly and informally explored at the first meeting of the regrouped Intergovernmental Committee.

Although the meeting was primarily organizational, governmental representatives attending did share ideas on problems which the separate units could work cooperatively on.

The first order of business was for members to get acquainted with each other as there has been a major turnover in representatives since the committee last met in February 1976. The only returning member was Plymouth City Commissioner Norb Battermann. Newcomers to the Intergovernmental Committee were Canton Supervisor Harold Stein, Plymouth Township Trustee Lee Fidge, and Plymouth-Canton School Trustee Flossie Tonda.

DURING A BRAINSTORMING session exploring areas in which the committee could become involved, the following ideas emerged: the issue of growth; sharing planning information for developments along the common boundaries; police protection; recreation facilities; and senior citizens.

Most of the discussion, though, centered on whether a joint dial-a-ride program would be practical or useful and what the townships' recreational needs would be once year-round scheduling is expanded in the school district.

Mrs. Fidge first raised the question

of a dial-a-ride mini bus service. Battermann observed that the idea had been explored by the City of Plymouth to provide transportation for senior citizens, but the city found it to be uneconomical. "It would be less useful if the vans ran only within city boundaries. But a community-wide service could be quite useful. The mini-bus idea might die in the city, but if we are talking about both townships joining in, it's a new ballgame."

STEIN REPORTED that Canton had purchased four vans with federal Community Development Act funds and is using the vans to transport senior citizens from their home to the township recreation hall for the hot lunch program.

"Canton is looking at the possibility of joining the Nankin Transportation Authority (NTA), which is tied in with the Southeast Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA). There's a chance the NTA might send buses to two points in Canton. If that works out, the township could then use the vans to transport citizens to those two points."

"Canton is to get two SEMTA route slots. The idea is to give the slots and two of our vans to the NTA as our payment to join the authority."

Battermann said the concept of dial-a-ride is short-haul transportation—a free taxi ride concept for the handicapped and for senior citizens.

Mrs. Fidge asked whether the serv-

ice couldn't be used by all residents, and suggested such an approach might be necessary in the future, depending on the seriousness of the energy crunch.

"If we can show we are recognized as a unified group," Battermann said, "we might get a composition grant for this group to establish a dial-a-ride program for the Plymouth-Canton community."

THE DISCUSSION turned to recreation needs when Stein pointed out that school sites will be used less for community recreation as more schools go on a year-round schedule.

Mrs. Tonda noted that the problem would be two-fold. First, youngsters enrolled in programs of the Plymouth-Canton Junior Athletic Association might be unable to play in the summer leagues if they are attending school during the summer. Second, the PCJAA would be unable to use school sites in the summer months while schools are in session.

The first expansion of ESY, for instance, will mean six school sites will be unavailable for recreation in the summer until after 3 p.m.

Mrs. Fidge added that new intramural or community enrichment programs might be started with year-round school to offset the loss of some summer league play.

THE COMMITTEE didn't decide on any specific issue for joint effort.

But members did agree the Intergovernmental Committee was needed. If nothing else, they felt, it provided a valuable forum for representatives to communicate with each other, share concerns, and exchange information of interest to all communities.

The members decided to go back to their governmental units and seek suggestions for possible involvement of the committee. The representatives agreed it would be worthwhile to meet again and seek representatives on the committee from Salem, Superior and Northville townships.

The first meeting ended at about 9 p.m., a planned adjournment so members could make it home to watch the second half of the basketball battle between the Titans and Wolverines.

Schools seek design input

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has approved a procedure to be followed before decisions are made on the design of new school buildings.

The procedure was drawn up in an attempt to provide means by which concerns of residents can be made known and incorporated into design plans.

The step was taken this year by the school board which heard numerous complaints last year from parents in Canton about the design of the three new elementary—Field, Hulsing and Eriksson.

The policy and procedures approved by the school board Monday night will be followed for design of the five elementary and two middle school buildings included in the proposed \$29 million bond issue which will go before voters April 23.

THE POLICY portion of the resolution states special attention will be given to:

- Educational specifications reflecting trends in educational program development.

- Optional teaching methods being accommodated.

- The educational specifications committee shall be comprised of teachers, administrators and citizens.

THE PROCEDURE section of the resolution provides that:

- A series of advertised public hearings precede board adoption of facility design.

- The primary goal in design will be to provide maximum teaching-learning space.

- Instructional spaces will be enclosed by appropriate floor to ceiling building materials.

- Special attention will be paid to providing essential sound control leading to optimum acoustical environment.

- Maximum energy conservation will be planned into all aspects of the building design.

- Cost and importance of effective maintenance will be considered in all

design decisions.

The motion to approve the policy and procedures was made by E.J. McClendon, supported by Flossie Tonda, and approved 6-0 with Tom Yack absent.

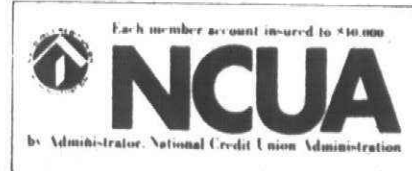

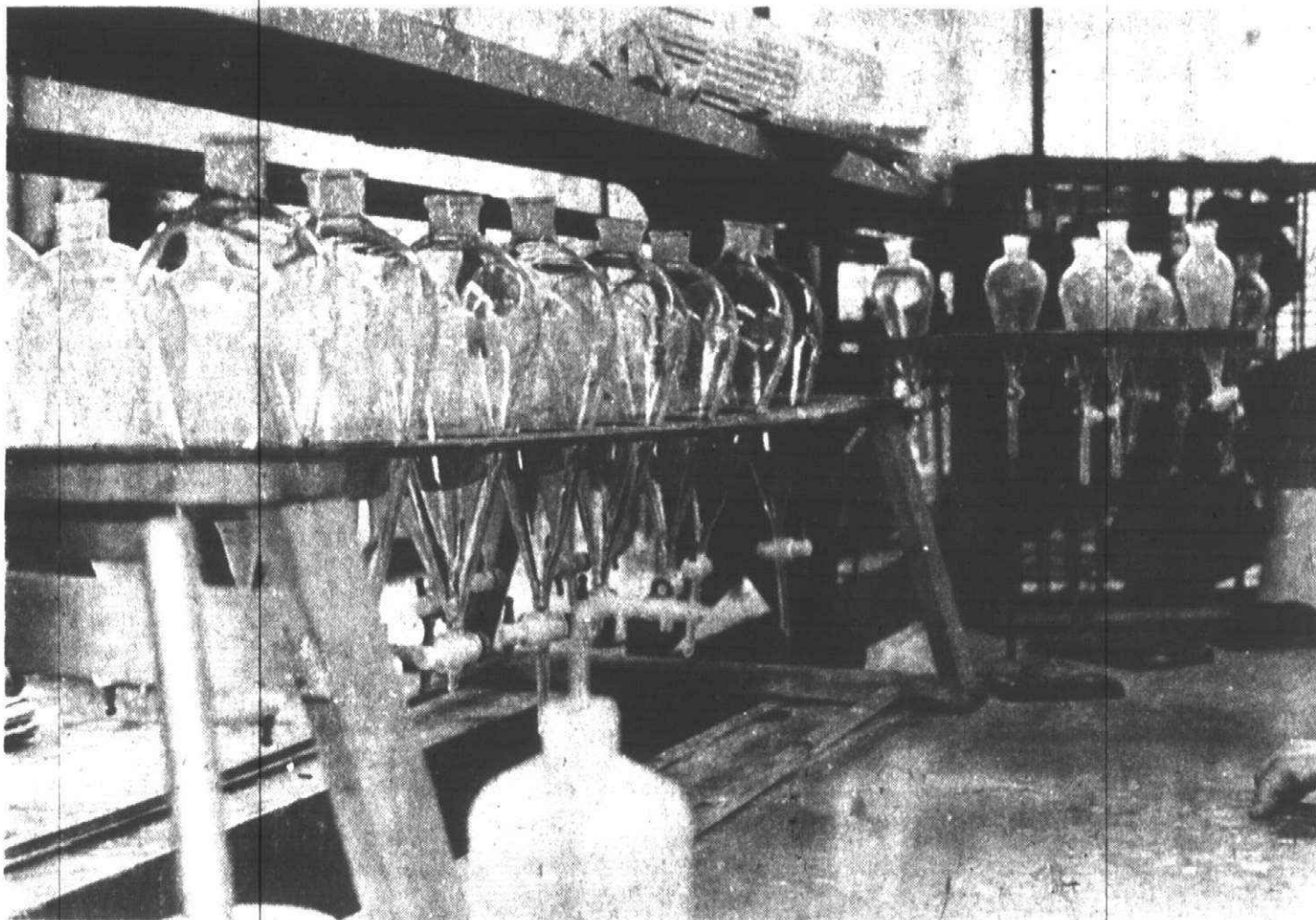

right to be concerned about contaminated foods, but he feels a consumer boycott of meat now is a case of too much too late.

"IT'S FUROR after the fact," Copeland said. "The horse left the county and you're wondering why he's not in the barn. Most PBB contamination occurred from September '73 through fall of '74. Ninety-five per cent of all the PBB that's in people was put there during that time. PBB was finally identified as the problem and we got it out of the food chain."

Dr. Copeland was asked what the long-term affects of PBB were. Has it been proven to be carcinogenic and is there an accumulative danger in consuming low levels of PBB?

"Well, it doesn't have an acute toxic affect," he said. "Some farm people consumed really 'hot' samples of meat and milk that gave them as high as a .7 reading. Some say they have the symptoms of PBB poisoning, others say they're fine."

"Nobody's dropped dead from PBB that we know of. It's not arsenic or cyanide. But it may very well be carcinogenic. That won't show up for 15 years. Nobody knows yet."

Mrs. Ann Gregory, a Leelanau County farm wife, spoke at a recent Michigan Farm Bureau press conference to complain against lowering the acceptable level of PBB. The farmers said they feared a lower level would further hurt their business. Mrs. Gregory emphasized that her three-month old daughter was breast-fed even though she had shown a .1 p.p.m. positive reading in a PBB analysis.

DR. COPELAND said he has no qualms about purchasing meat in the local supermarket "without taking to the lab first and testing it."

Copeland says people are "barking up the wrong tree" in worrying about low levels of PBB when they could be concerned about affects of eating polychlorinated biphenol (PCB), one of the most stable synthetic elements known to man.

"We have found a median level of .07 PCB in meat," Copeland said. "It's been found in recycled paper used to wrap food products. It lines silo covers. PCB has been used in industry since the '20's. The chemical was hailed as a real breakthrough. In liquid form it is non-flammable and doesn't burn up in the most extreme heat."

"We used 47,000 tons of PCB last year."

At this point, the chemical analyst drew three boxes on a large legal pad. He labeled the largest box, PCB, a box half that size was labeled DDE,

a by-product of the banned chemical DDT, and the third and smallest box was labeled PBB.

In the bottom corner of the "PBB box" Copeland drew in another tiny box.

The size of the boxes correspond to the median amounts of contaminants found in meat, Copeland said. And the tiny box within the PBB box.

"That's the comparable size of .02 parts per million PBB that some members of the legislature wants to impose on us," he said.

Dr. Copeland was asked if he was aghast at the amount of chemical contaminants in our foods that he and his assistants find in the lab.

"The public really has nobody to blame but itself (for these chemicals)," Copeland said. "They were the ones who said I want a cured sausage that I can hang in my kitchen for two months. They're the ones who wanted to keep pasteurized milk in their refrigerator for two weeks and store cereal on their shelves for months at a time. They were the ones who demanded a red-looking Red Dye No. 2 cherry in their Manhattan."

"Then, if the food doesn't taste as good as it used to because of all the preservatives, we just add a little monosodium glutamate (MSG) to stimulate your taste buds," he added sardonically.

would also be less expensive in the long run," he said.

He added that it would probably be two years before the work would be completed if it is finally approved.

One man wanted to know if there would be an overpass or underpass at the railroad.

Nothing has been decided. None of our recommendations for improvement of the road have yet been decided upon.

The prime purpose of the recent meeting was to gain input from residents and to stimulate communication and cooperation.

Once the ideas and suggestions from residents have been studied, the department will come up with a recommendation. Following that, there will be series of public hearings in which the highway department will present to the public its findings and recommendations.

The department will then review all data collected as well as the public hearing comments before it makes the decision as to what alternative will be proposed.

While the highway department lays out the route, designs the highway and acquires the land, all new con-

struction work is done by private businessmen who bid in competition with one another. The lowest bidder gets the job.

The work includes the jobs of clearing the first path through the brush to putting up the last fence.

Funds for the construction and maintenance of highways are administered and allotted by both the federal and state governments.

Federal taxes on fuel, tires, oil and other items go into a Federal Highway Trust Fund for distribution to the 50 states.

State highway funds come mainly from a state tax on gasoline and diesel fuel as well as a weight tax collected through the sale of license plates.

Michigan's 83 counties and its 530 incorporated cities and villages all share state gas and weight taxes under a formula prescribed by state law, the highway department explained.

Cost of building a highway depends on where it is and the type.

An eight-lane freeway built through the heart of a major city may cost \$15 million a mile or more. Construction of urban freeways average \$8 million a mile and construction of rural freeways average \$2 million a mile.

Some Canton farmers use PCP preservative

A spokesperson for the Michigan Agricultural Department says barns in the Plymouth-Canton area could be treated with Pentachlorophenol (PCP), a wood preservative containing dioxins that has poisoned eight herds of cattle in Michigan and could contaminate the food they produce.

Examination of the local dairy herds for PCP or "penta" poisoning is not planned at this time, however, said Margaret McCall, information officer for the agricultural department.

"Herds won't be tested at the present time, if they have no health problems," she said. "But penta-treated wood is very common. It's been distributed across the country."

A diagnostic team, composed of veterinarians from Michigan State University and the agricultural department, recently discovered Penta in the blood of eight dairy herds in out-state Michigan.

THE LEAST ONE local resident, who raises cattle, sheep and other animals for his own consumption, suspects that the wood in his barn and the underside of his house is treated with Penta. But Canton resident Bart Berg says he isn't worried.

"I know my barn is treated, and it could very well have PCP in it," Berg said. "But I'm not frightened. As far

as I'm concerned, the media has done a disservice to the public. I think the publicity has blown this and the thing about PBB out of proportion."

The eight herds in Michigan with known penta poisoning have all been quarantined. Dioxin, a toxic contaminant that sometimes appears during the manufacture of penta, has been discovered in the tissue of one of the herds in the Grand Rapids area.

The animals were poisoned by the chemical when they licked PCP treated wood.

Ms. McCall said the toxin was discovered in the herds' blood, while the diagnostic team was testing the herds for PBB—a toxic fire retardant that was accidentally mixed with cattle feed three years ago. The herds were ill, she said, but no or little PBB was discovered in their systems.

Agricultural department officials have asked the FDA to test the milk of the quarantined herds to determine if penta has entered the human food chain.

Health officials do not know the effects of penta contamination on the human system, but suspect the toxin could damage the liver.

The agricultural Department has also taken action that will halt the future sale of PCP-treated wood in Michigan.

Spring courses on nature offered at Schoolcraft

Schoolcraft College has scheduled a five-course natural science series during April and May.

The first, on the cultivation of cacti and succulents, will meet on four Thursdays from 7-9 p.m. in Room 150 of the Forum Building beginning April 7.

According to instructor Roger Anderson, the course will provide an introduction to the biology and horticulture of desert plants, including their general classification, structural features, general care and feeding, pests and diseases and propagation.

A course on spring birds is scheduled for five weeks beginning April 12. This class will meet two Tuesdays from 7-9 p.m. in Room 170 of the Forum Building. Field experiences are then scheduled on three Saturdays from 8 a.m. to noon through May 21.

Instructor Grover Niergarth will provide a general study of Michigan's birds. Topics to be covered include assistance in bird identification, natural history and interrelationship with the environment.

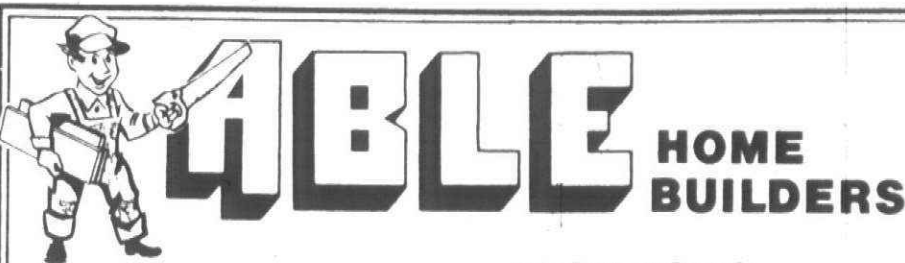
Spring flora is scheduled for eight weeks beginning April 15. Six Friday evening classes from 7-9 p.m. in Room 250 of the Forum Building are planned. Two Saturday morning field experiences in May and June are also scheduled.

Naturalist Mary Ellis, assisted by biologist Roger Sutherland, will instruct this course covering a general study of Michigan's spring wildflowers with emphasis on their identification, natural history and ecology.

A general botany course will be offered for eight weeks on Mondays through Thursdays from 8 a.m. to noon in Room 170 of the Forum Building beginning May 2.

This field oriented four credit-hour course will be taught by Ray Stiles and will cover the fundamental structure and physiology of plants, relationships of the plant kingdom, field identification and use of botanical keys.

Beekeeping field experience is scheduled for eight weeks beginning May 6. The first class will meet on Friday evening from 7-9 p.m. in Room 270 of the Forum Building. Seven succeeding field experiences at the college and nearby apiaries are planned on Saturday mornings from 9-11 a.m.

At that figure, he beat out Ron Bourgeois, who linked games of 245, 208 and 199 for 652.

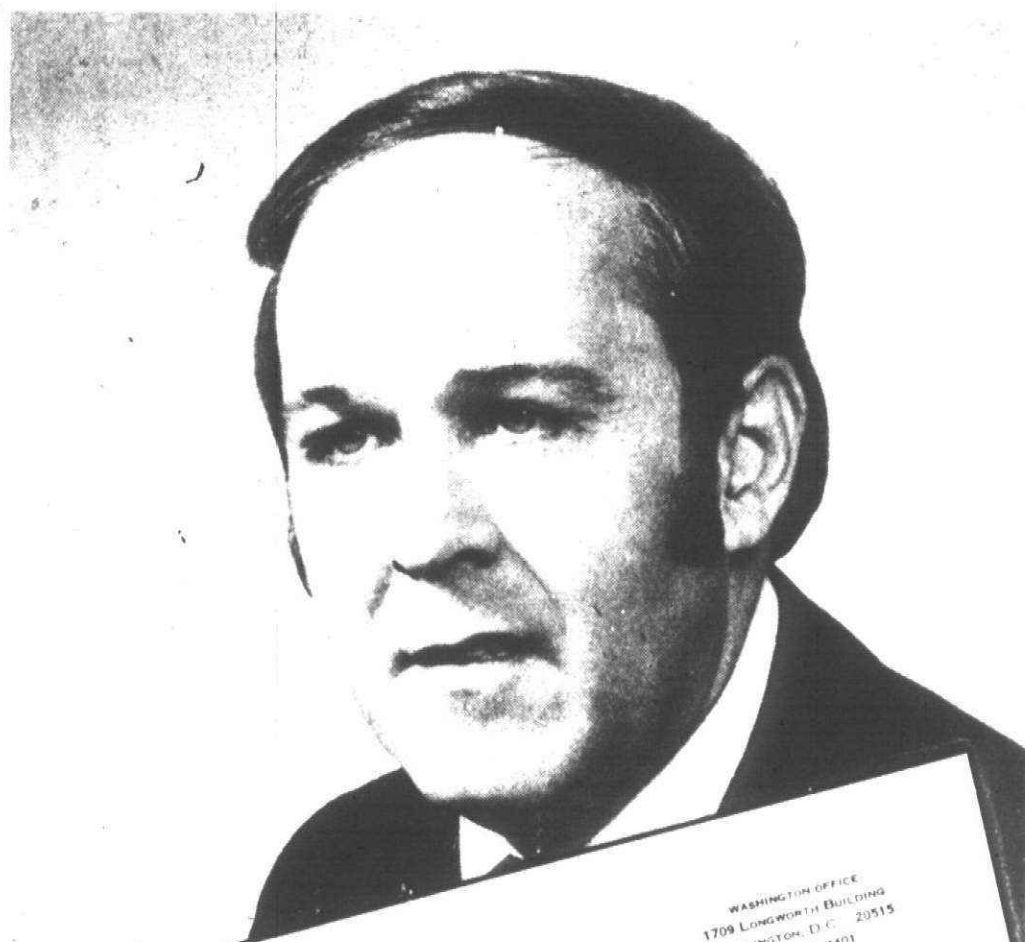

DR. CHARLES WELLS Jr. of Plymouth recently attended a meeting of the school and college lighting committee of the Illuminating Engineering Society (IES) in New York. The committee is completely revising the educational facilities lighting section of the sixth edition of the society's "Lighting Handbook" which will be published late in 1979.

Wells is a school planning consultant for the Wayne County Intermediate School District. He has been a member of lighting committee for the past 10 years and helped prepare the fifth edition of the handbook which is a basic reference for lighting engineers all over the world.

With new energy-conserving building codes being adopted by many states, school districts need a reference when budgeting for new facilities.

Wells was named chairman of a sub-committee which is to adapt an IES recommendation to the needs of those planning school lighting. Proper application of the procedure provides a useful estimate of the lighting power requirements of a new building before the lighting system is designed.

The new peach glow lamps which are being used on expressways and for outdoor lighting of buildings are among the innovations which save energy.

"They also enhance the appearance of the buildings after dark," said Wells. "Placed so they shine on the buildings from ground level, they are an aid in police protection. Anyone nearing the building casts a giant shadow on the structure which is spotted easily by passing police cars."

"The lamps last longer and stand extreme heat and cold better than the traditional lamps."

When asked about the latest color for blackboards, he laughed. "The green boards replaced the blackboards because they were supposed to be more restful to the students' eyes. Then it was decided brown boards with yellow chalk were superior. There are a lot of schools in Birmingham with brown boards—and you know how difficult it is to erase the yellow chalk."

'Astrology doesn't run our lives'

"The astrology chart is like a road map," said astrologist Jeanne Avery at the final Livonia Town Hall lecture of the year. "It gives us a sense of direction."

"Astrology doesn't run our lives. It helps us understand the pattern of our lives, and shows we can grow, expand and change our lives," she added.

"It is not an exact science. It is based on astronomy. Like medicine, the art of astrology is based on the art of the particular practitioner."

Astrologists such as Ms. Avery have their own vocabulary—words like planetary position, sun signs, ascendancy, cusp, house, wheel, cycles and charts. They wrap these terms around a belief that the heavenly bodies have an influence on human behavior, though as yet, Ms. Avery indicated, no one knows why or how.

Given an individual's date, place and time of birth, astrologists can cast a chart that may tell him that he wants a life full of fun and stimulation (Gemini) or is analytical and a nit-picker (Virgo).

BUT THE SIGN under which one was born does not mean everything. Ms. Avery pointed out that she is writing a book on the ascendancy question, meaning that at certain times a planet may also exert a force which alters the original diagnosis.

Other celestial aspects in the chart can further refine and alter one's

chart, making it as individual as a thumb print.

She added, "We use it less to predict the events in a person's life than to stimulate him and unfold to him his creative potential."

Calling astrology "a much maligned subject," the speaker noted that it promises no panacea for living.

She told a story about a man whose chart she prepared.

"I informed him that he was squelching a talent, maybe a musical talent," she said. "He denied it but a month later called me back to tell me he was working with his therapist and uncovered the moment when he turned off his ears, rebelling at the authoritarian aspect of his childhood piano lessons."

"A month later he got his first job as an audio consultant."

Ms. Avery feels that astrology gave him confirmation of what he had learned in therapy.

"Astrology can give a person permission to do what he secretly wants to do," she said.

THE ASTROLOGIST sees a close relationship between her subject and psychology. "Many psychologists are beginning to use astrology," she said. "But they don't tell an one. When I work with a therapist, we work from two different points of view and arrive at the same results."

"It has been very helpful with mentally disturbed people."

She pointed out that early environment can influence a person more than the stars. "Stars do not influence you," she said. "Just as a road map doesn't drive the car. With the humanistic approach I follow, astrology doesn't make judgements. It indicates potential. Then it is up to you what you do about it."

"It will not be astrology that changes your life, but it can be the key that makes you more aware of what changes are possible."

Having a chart done can be costly and complicated, she noted, in response to a question from a member of the audience. The average price is about \$60.

Answering another question asking why twins born under the same sign can have different personalities, she said that the minutes separating their birth can be important.

"It would put the planets in a totally different house," she said. "Eight minutes can mean a variance of two years in patterns. A chart is based on the moment a child takes its first breath."

MS. AVERY who writes a daily syndicated column called "Star Tracking," published in other parts of the country, explained some of the terms used by astrologists.

"House is a word for a division of the chart," she said. "Each house symbolizes a section in your life."

For example, the third house re-

Gary Randolph, the professional who will direct the all-community folies "Jest Foolin," arrived in town last week. He came from Santa Rosa, Calif. where a hospital auxiliary had sponsored a revue which was a sellout for its three-night run.

"It is much easier the second time round," said Randolph. "It was our third show in Santa Rosa." In the cities where the folies has become an annual or semi-annual event, the local singers, dancers, actors and musicians are waiting to participate, and the audience is waiting for the tickets to go on sale.

The Plymouth Community Arts Council is sponsoring "Jest Foolin" which will be a first for this area and consequently will involve more work for the director.

"IT IS REALLY a revue," said Randolph. "There will be 23 acts and a short 15-minute intermission."

"We need more men," he added. The director and the PCAC hope to have a cast of 200 for the show which will open April 1 in Plymouth Salem High School auditorium for a two-day run.

Randolph lives in Manhattan but "has been in show business all my life." He grew up in Indiana and after a taste of the theatre in high school productions, he headed for New York when he was 17.

"I had lots of hope but not much else," he recalls.

He started out as a song and dance man and his first job in New York was with Bill Robinson in the old Roxy Theater. "The theater is now defunct. Tommy Dorsey and his orchestra played with show."

"The longest I ever went without eating was four days. That was in California. I'd gone one day and two days, but four days was the longest."

HE SPENT FOUR years in the Orient, "I was back and forth—Japan,

Korea, Taiwan—but was there for a total of four years."

While in Japan, he was in the cast of a science fiction movie.

"It was an all-American cast with a Japanese director," he said. "Robert Horton was the star. Besides the communication problem, the meteorite looked like a big meatball. It was a terrible movie. It finally was released for late night television."

Randolph told of some of the humorous sidelights of making a movie in Japan. Their dressing rooms had half doors. "Not the bottom half as you would expect, but the top half. There was no privacy for your lower extremities."

He said, "The Japanese fold everything." The costumes were not on hangers as in American theatre but neatly folded and stacked between performances.

"In one scene in the space station, we were supposed to eat. They brought in trays of finger sandwiches and fancy foods." The American actors did not believe party foods served on fine china was authentic space station fare.

HE WAS RELUCTANT to reveal the title of the science fiction thriller but, after some persuasion, said it was "The Green Slime."

His revues usually include some acts with an oriental theme, the result of his sojourn in the East and his theatrical experiences in that part of the world.

With less than two weeks of rehearsal time remaining, Randolph has a busy schedule—six hours of actual directing each day and myriad other chores.

The result will be apparent April 1 and 2.

He believes the excitement, the emotion and the enthusiasm of the cast make for a successful production.

The wit behind the comediennes

"Fang's so tight—what other family uses a Bible from the library?"

"When a mother says she's sad to see her child go off to school, you know she will lie about other things."

Mary McBride, the comedy writer who authored those Phyllis Dillerisms, recalled examples of her homey wit to keep more than 700 Northville Town Hall members laughing at the third lecture of the current season at the Plymouth Hilton Inn.

As top writer for comedienne Diller for 17 years and the chief source of material for Joan Rivers, Mrs. McBride confided that a prime inspiration has been her children.

My children, she says, "are really great. I've told them they can insult me if there's any profit in it."

She's the mother of five, ranging in age from 26 to 17, all still at home and now contributors to her comedy writing, which has included collaborating on such Phyllis Diller best sellers as "Phyllis Diller's Housekeeping Hints," "Phyllis Diller's Marriage Manual" and "Phyllis Diller, the Complete Mother."

She remembers her first joke used by Phyllis Diller:

"The reason I'm not an alcoholic is that I don't like to drink in front of the kids and, when I'm away from them, I don't need it."

MARY McBRIDE became Phyllis Diller's writer after she sent some ideas to her where she was appearing in a nightclub.

She and her family have been guests of the star at her home in California and in Las Vegas and are fans.

She's very happy about her financial well-being. Mrs. McBride told

her audience, "for her first husband had 15 jobs in one year. She was a stand-up comedienne as she had a sit-down husband."

Mrs. McBride's husband, who was a teacher-coach, died in 1972. Before his death, he too contributed to the store of jokes in which she's often the object of humor.

"I was wearing a long white dress I had made myself," she recalls, "and as we went out the door he said, 'Don't yawn—they'll think it's a night-gown.'"

He did encourage her when she first was invited to speak to a woman's group.

When she commented that she had no experience in public speaking, he observed, "But you've had so much in private."

THE SPEAKER also is a supplier of cartoon ideas to cartoonists and magazines as well as a short story writer. She urged her audience to send their ideas to stars or to publications, especially small ones.

When she submitted her first story she tried to be casual about it with her family, commenting, "Oh well, it probably will come back."

"Or, it might get lost in the mail," was the quick put-down.

"It was my father who taught me the most important thing in life is to be able to adjust," she told her audience.

"I never was with him without laughing. He was 84 when he became ill and was taken to the hospital. He asked the ambulance driver, 'Will this be a round trip or a one-way one?'"

Mary McBride's humor also has been the subject for family-oriented

"Grin and Bear It" and Bil Keane "Family Circus" drawings.

One, she described, showed a mother spanking the child and commenting, "Remember, my tranquilizers come out of your allowance."

Another example:

A couple is going out the door, leaving a baby sitter coping in the back-ground, and the wife is saying to the husband, "Do I have to tell where we can be reached?"

And, same scene:

"We'll be someplace in Wisconsin."

ANOTHER CARTOON idea, the author recalled, showed a man at the office calling home and commenting, "I always call home at noon. It's easier to take a half a day's complaints."

Mrs. McBride also sold a cartoon showing a daughter bringing home a hippie boy friend to the family. The caption she suggested was, "If you intend keeping it, you're going to have to feed and take care of it yourself."

Mary McBride still lives in her home in Janesville, Wis. although, she says, Phyllis Diller would like her to come to California.

She has copied her boss' habit, the speaker told Town Hall, of "listening constantly."

"She has taught me to pick up ideas from everyday comments, such as when I asked if my stockings bagged at the knees and a friend replied, 'Yes, but they give you a little shape.'"

"Then my sister commented, 'I don't drink when you drive.'"

COMEDIENNE DILLER often has requested jokes on specific topics, and these are some the writer-speaker has supplied:

On smoking—

"The worst thing about giving up smoking is finding that your teeth are yellow anyway."

On family fighting—

Husband to wife: "You wouldn't know it was raining outside unless the phone leaked."

On Groucho Marx—

"What good does it do me to scrub this floor with that duck hanging from the ceiling?"

For Joan Rivers, who wanted woman doctor jokes, she supplied: "To the patient with liver spots the doctor prescribed wearing either green or brown."

And, on abortion—

"The abortionist's so busy he has to be booked 10 months in advance."

NOTING THAT she has derived her greatest financial help from the books she authored with Phyllis Diller, Mary McBride told Town Hall that she now has publishers interested in a tongue-in-cheek beauty book that she hopes will come out under her own by-line.

Her daughter has worked with her on this effort.

Mrs. McBride obviously is pleased that her children, too, have a sense of humor. Turning serious, she expressed concern that today "many children aren't geared to laughter."

The message in her morning of humor was given in a recitation of the Optimist Creed, which ended: "Think on the sunny side of everything."

And, when luncheon was late in arriving, Mary McBride had a comment to continue the morning's happy mood: "You should serve meals late—the starving eat anything."

Don't touch odometer

There are certain federal regulations that must be followed in selling a used car. Each person selling or transferring ownership of a motor vehicle is required to furnish a written, signed statement containing the odometer reading at the time of transfer.

The statement must also contain the date of transfer; the address of the seller; the make, model and year of the vehicle; its body type, identification number and last license plate. In addition, if the seller knows that the odometer reading is different from the actual number of miles the vehicle has traveled, he or she must include a statement that the actual mileage is unknown.

Because some people have made improper use of this statement, particularly those who are guilty of odometer rollbacks, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has moved to improve the regulation requiring certain information about the odometer. A section of the Motor Vehicle Information and Cost Savings Act, enacted in 1972, make it unlawful to tamper with an odometer for the purpose of concealing the actual mileage of a vehicle.

As an additional safeguard for buyers, who usually rely on the odometer as a guide to a vehicle's condition and value, the NHTSA issued odometer disclosure requirements that became effective March 1, 1973.

Now the NHTSA proposes to require sellers to indicate either that the odometer reading is true, the reading is not true and should not be relied upon, or the reading reflects the number of miles in excess of the designed-mechanical odometer limit.

The federal safety agency also wants sellers to

certify that the odometer was not altered, set back, or disconnected while he or she was the owner of the vehicle. Another requirement would have both buyer and seller sign the disclosure statement, instead of only the seller.

Amendments to the Cost Savings Act provide for civil and criminal penalties for odometer violations. Any violation could result in a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 or a criminal penalty of up to \$50,000, one year imprisonment, or both. The Secretary of Transportation is authorized to conduct any inspections or investigations necessary to protect consumers from odometer rollback or tampering.
