Stein pushing \$1 million golf course

Canton Supervisor Harold Stein believes profits from Fellows Creek Golf Course could reinforce the township's entire recreational program if the course were to be publicly owned.

Although Stein refused to disclose details of a study conducted by the accounting firm of Seidman & Seidman on the feasibility of Canton purchasing and operating the estimated \$1 million golf course, the supervisor said the study concludes that Canton could show a profit as soon as the first year.

Township officials should use profits generated by the 18-hole course to improve the golf club and recreational facilities throughout the township, Stein said.

CANTON BOARD MEMBERS have been secretly discussing purchase of the now privately-owned Fellows Creek Golf Course since last March, when Stein first learned that owner Whitney Ballantine and other members of his corporation were offering the course for sale.

Until this week, Stein and other township officials had attempted to keep negotiations with the golf course owners a secret. Stein said the owners had requested no publicity on the matter, because they feared news of a possible sale would upset course employees and golfers and reveal the corporation's financial record.

Ballantine, a principal stockholder in Fellows Creek Golf Course, Inc., said the golf course is in good financial shape. Ballantine said he decided to sell because of his "old age."

"We just think it's in fine financial shape," he said. "No financial trouble here at all."

The supervisor said he decided to release some information about the proposed golf course purchase this week, after news of the secret negotiations leaked out a few weeks ago.

"I can't believe it," said Stein, noting criticism of the secret negotiations. "They're trying to make a big deal out of this now. I'm going to bring it all out in the open now."

Although Stein pledged to release information about the proposed golf course buy, he refused to pin down a

possible purchase price or disclose details of the Seidman & Seidman feasibility study claiming the financial status of the current owners would be revealed.

He did say, however, that the 115-acre course and clubhouse are valued at \$900,000. That evaluation does not

include the cost of equipment and supplies.

"When it is time to tell the purchase price, you'll have it all," said Stein. "The deal isn't consummated yet."

Other board members said the pur-

chase price is \$1 million.

ACCORDING TO STEIN, the township has already received tentative approval for a \$200,000 state grant from the Land and Water Conservation Fund that could be used toward the purchase price.

A building authority, established a few weeks ago to sell bonds for recreational purposes, would raise the rest of the money needed to purchase the course by floating bonds. The bonds would be retired over a 20-year period, the supervisor explained.

"But the way we have it figured, the township will be able to pay the yearly bond payments and still have money left over," Stein said. "It's a known fact that golf courses are money-making businesses."

If the township purchases the course, officials will contract a management firm or individual to run the course on a day-to-day basis. Stein said. The golf course will remain public, existing green fees will remain unchanged, and existing golf leagues will be allowed to stay.

STEIN BELIEVES Fellows Creek will be owned and operated by the township by the start of the 1978 golfing season.

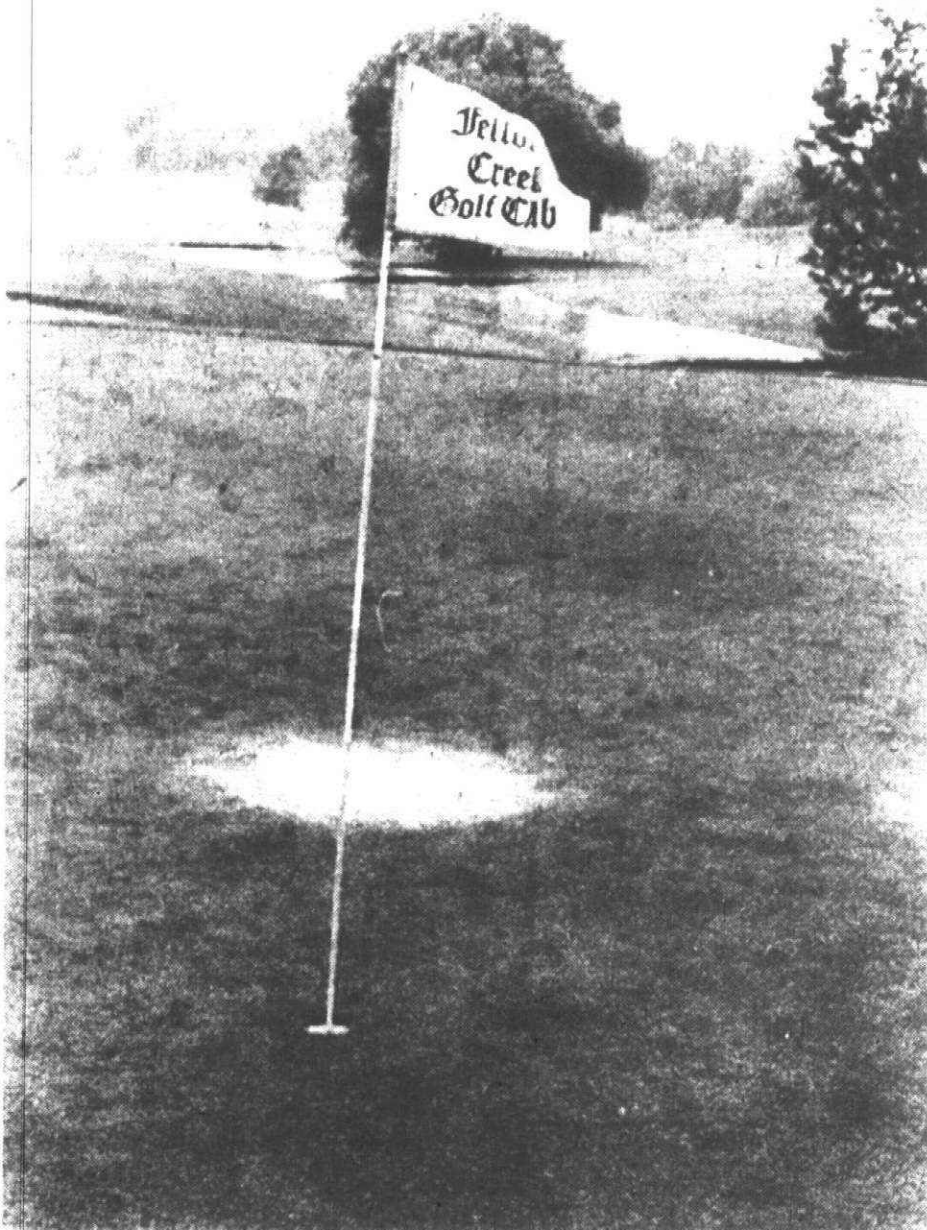
Trustee Robert Myers believes he is the only board member who would vote against purchasing the golf course. Myers said he was the only official who voted against the proposed purchase in an informal private poll. Trustee Brian Schwall was absent.

"I place law enforcement and preservation of farmland higher than buying a golf course," Myers said.

But Stein and Frank McMurray, chairman of the township's recreation commission, feel public purchase of the golf course would serve township residents by providing recreation and preserving open space.

The township may one day use profits from the course to develop five acres of the facility into a multi-recreational park with a swimming pool and tennis courts, Stein suggested.

"It's a pretty decent course right now," Stein stressed. "and it's in pretty good shape."

Sewer motion has little effect

Two of Canton's most active developers appear confused but unruffled by a recent township board resolution that warns developers of Canton's limited sewer capacity and the possibility that sewage and water services will be unavailable for new homes.

Howard Binkow of Republic Development Corporation and Richard Lewiston of Practical Homebuilders said they doubt whether the resolution would have any effect on their building activity in Canton. Neither holds immediate plans to plat any new subdivisions not already approved.

Both developers withheld extensive comment on the township board's warning to developers until they have studied the resolution.

TOWNSHIP BOARD members hope the resolution they approved last week put psychological pressure on developers to halt new subdivision plattings.

Because of the township's limited sewer capacity and building boom, board members had originally planned to impose a moratorium on new subdivision plat approvals until more sewers could be built.

The board dropped the moratorium idea and opted for a warning, after attorney Bert Burgoyne said the township lacks the authority to impose a moratorium.

"All those who seek approval of plans for development of any land in Canton Township will be advised of the sewer capacity situation," states

the resolution adopted by board members last week. "And although approval to subdivide will be given, it cannot be guaranteed that such property when developed into lots will be able to connect to the existing sewers."

The resolution requires developers to inform prospective lot buyers in writing that connection to existing sewers may not be available.

NEITHER LEWISTON nor Binkow fully understand the resolution's wording or ramifications.

"I really have no response to it yet," Lewiston said. "I don't really understand what it means. The law doesn't require the township to guarantee anything, and here they're saying they can't guarantee what they're not required to."

Binkow called the resolution "sketchy."

"I can't call it awful until I know at what stage of development they're talking about," he said. "In the past, we've never found the people out in Canton to be unreasonable. A developer never has a problem when a unit of government says something up front."

"But right now, we don't even know what they're talking about."

Canton Supervisor Harold Stein said the township will make no effort to inform developers of the resolution until they request subdivision plat approvals. No developers have contacted the township about the matter, the supervisor said.

Dial-a-Ride arrives— Mrs. Kuhn rides free

When you're legally blind like Canton resident Wilma Kuhn, getting to the doctor's office or grocery store is no easy task.

While most people hop behind the wheel of their car and take off, Mrs. Kuhn must beseech her husband to take a day off work or ask her mother to drive in from Holly just so she can make her monthly doctor's visit.

Beginning next Monday, however, most of Mrs. Kuhn's transportation worries will disappear when dial-a-ride buses for Canton's senior citizens and handicapped residents first begin to roll.

UNDER THE PROGRAM sponsored by the Nankin Transit Commission, handicapped persons of all ages,

as well as persons over 55 may travel from their doorsteps to any location within Canton's eastern half, Westland, Wayne, Inkster and Garden City for a nominal fee.

To reserve a place on the buses, residents must call the NTC dispatch center at 729-2710. Residents who plan a trip to a doctor's office, dentist's office or nutritional food program will receive top priority on NTC buses and are asked to call the NTC dispatch center before noon two working days before their planned trips. All other residents must reserve a place on the bus one working day in advance.

Buses are scheduled to operate Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Although the standard price of a one-way ticket for seniors and the handicapped is 25 cents, blind persons like Mrs. Kuhn travel for free. Friends or relatives who accompany a handicapped person on the bus may travel for a one-way fee of 50 cents.

Mrs. Kuhn, whose eyesight has steadily deteriorated over the last six years, says she will use the dial-a-ride service often for doctor office visits and shopping trips.

The 50-year-old Canton resident who recently attended the Kalamazoo School for the Blind says the service will enable her to enroll in volunteer

Dangerous use of cranes is still common in Canton

Apparent violations of a state crane safety law were observed at all but one township construction site during a random check earlier this week.

Last month, a young construction worker was crushed to death in a crane accident at a Canton building site. State authorities, saying the man's employer had violated crane safety laws, slapped the employer with a stiff fine.

At two of three sites where a crane was being operated, barricades had not been placed around the swing radius of the crane's counterweight as required by a 1974 state law.

Visits to several other sites showed that barricades were not in place although the cranes were not being run at the time.

Last month 23-year-old Chuck Kennedy was crushed to death by a crane while working for Acitelli and Peterman Poured Concrete Wall Co. at a Canton subdivision development.

Peter Acitelli, owner of the Farmington firm, was fined \$10,000 on July 8 for failing to rope off or barricade the area between the crane's counterweight and frame.

At the two sites where cranes were being operated in violation of state law, workers told the Observer that they didn't feel a barricade was necessary or required.

Only one construction site inspected by the Observer appeared to be in compliance with the law. The counterweight area of a crane at the site of the new Canton Township administration building was roped off, and the word "Danger" was printed on the rear. The R.E. Dailey Co. is construction manager at the township site.

Despite these findings, Joseph Wrzesinski, chief of the Michigan Department of Labor's construction safety division, said that his field inspections show most contractors are complying with the law. He added that the safety requirement has been known to all contractors since its enactment, a contention which Acitelli denies.

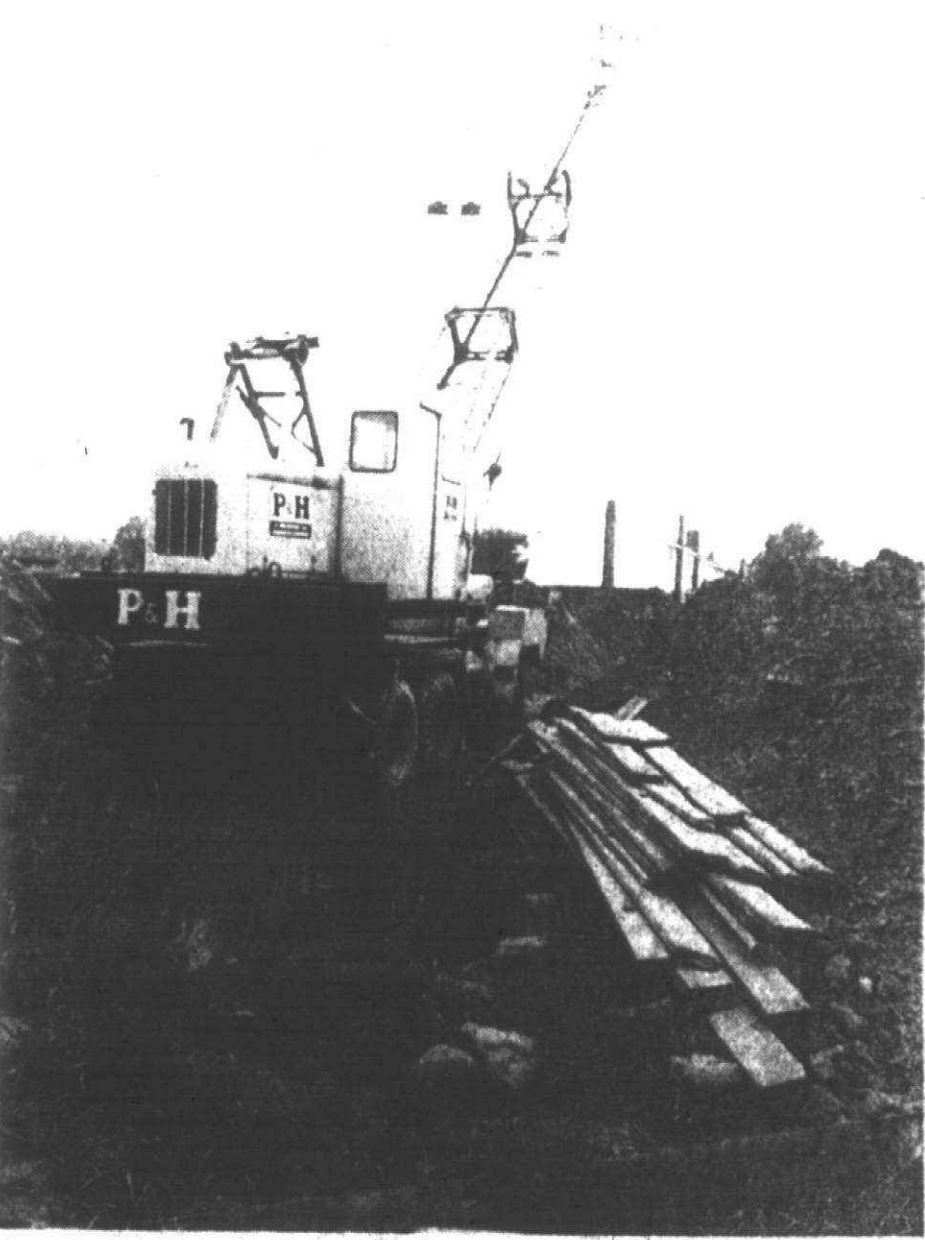
Acitelli, who has appealed the \$10,000 fine imposed on his firm by the state department of labor, said he has yet to see any other contractor in the area obeying the barricade requirement.

"Why are they singling me out," Acitelli said. "What're they trying to do—make another DiPonio out of me? Look at how they hounded that guy."

Angelo DiPonio was cited by the Department of Labor two years ago for allowing unsafe conditions in a fatal tunnel blast under Lake St. Clair. The court eventually found DiPonio innocent of willful neglect.

Under the Michigan Department of Labor's appeal process, Acitelli first will "informally" present his rebuttal to the department's charges. Fifteen days later, the department chief will decide if the case against the contractor merits prosecution and a fine.

If the state still wishes to pursue the matter and seek the fine, a pre-hearing is scheduled between the contractor and the construction safety division chief. If this meeting does not end in a settlement, a hearing before the Health Safety Compliance Appeals Board is scheduled. If the charges and the fine are upheld by the appeals board, the contractor may take the case to circuit court to fight it.

Growth works looks for tutors

Mary, a 34-year-old housewife, would like to improve her reading skills. And the Growth Works, Inc. learning center would like to help her. But they don't have enough tutors.

Mary is just one of the people who want to take advantage of the tutoring service provided free through the Our House Crisis Center on Harvey Street.

But because there are not enough qualified tutors to go around, chances are that she, like others, will just have to wait.

"We desperately need qualified people," said Laura Upton, who coordinates the learning center. "Our most critical need is in the areas of math and reading, particularly for the elementary level."

"But we are interested in talking to anybody who feels they have enough expertise in a subject to help people learn that subject better."

USUALLY THE LEARNING center—or Braintrust, as it is informally called—operates with a staff of 12 tutors. However, summer vacations have cut a swath through the ranks. Right now, only three tutors are available.

But even when summer is over and some of the regulars return, Upton said there will still be room for expansion.

"I would like to tutor more older people from church groups and other clubs. And I'm sure if I advertised we'd get them. I just don't dare do it. I'd have to turn them away."

Although the majority of those who avail themselves of the free tutoring are school children, Upton said there are any number of adults who find

themselves in need of extra help. "Sometimes a housewife wants to enter the job market and wants to brush up on some basic skills. Or a person already working finds a need to learn a little more."

"If we could find enough people willing to tutor, we could easily expand the program to handle 40 or 50 students every month. As of now there are about 18, and the three tutors we have are really working. Some days I have appointments every half hour all day long."

The tutoring program started out last year in the back of a store on Penniman Avenue. At the beginning, tutors would be on duty for several hours a day and would take students on a walk-in basis.

However, the response was so large that they moved to the house on Harvey and started tutoring by appointment.

The tutors range in age from 21 to 43. And when everyone is present and accounted for, there are four certified teachers with different specialties, a mathematician, and a number of college students who offer their time and knowledge.

"It's not enough just to have the skill," Upton commented. "It's more important to feel comfortable enough with the skill to build a rapport with someone else."

"I would say the most important quality is the ability to listen, and I mean really listen to what someone else is saying. I guess it's more of an attitude than anything else."

Schools find it difficult to get driver's ed cars

The pricetag of purchasing a new car may inconvenience many consumers, but the rising costs are creating havoc for school districts teaching young persons to drive.

The driver education program for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools has been saddled with rising increases in the cost of car rentals and is budgeted at nearly double its present expenditures in 1977-78.

Not only is the price of renting vehicles skyrocketing, but car dealers are slowly withdrawing from providing schools with new automobiles because of staggering financial losses, according to Clarence DuCharme of Fiesta Motors in Plymouth. One company dropped \$26,000 renting training cars in a single year and Fiesta lost \$10,000 in 1974, DuCharme said.

New cars are usually rented to school districts on a per day basis and returned within three or four months, said Fred Meier, head of the Plymouth-Canton driver education program. The loss to car dealers is the rate of interest paid during the period the schools rent the cars.

THE BEST DEAL to be found, according to Meier, comes from General Motors dealers, which charge \$1.50 per car per day.

The Plymouth-Canton program presently rents 10 cars for its summer session, eight of which belong to three different GM dealers. They are Bob Jeannotte Pontiac, Lou LaRiche Chevrolet of Plymouth, and Armstrong Buick of Livonia.

The remaining two cars were difficult to locate, Meier said, when Carpenter Sales (Dodge) in Wayne abruptly terminated its service last month. The schools rented the two cars from Bill Brown Ford of Livonia for \$100 a week (more than \$3 per day).

The driver education program began in Plymouth in 1955 when the state first provided partial reimbursement, Meier said. At the time, only one or two cars were needed and the schools had to purchase them because no dealers offered rentals.

In the early 1960s, Meier said the auto companies made rebates available to their dealers for rentals to local driver training programs. The dealers then provided schools with cars at no charge until 1974, when the price of new autos and interest rates began to soar, but the company reimbursement rate stood pat.

Consequently, Plymouth-Canton schools paid \$585 in rental fees for 1975-76, but \$2,680 during the 1976-77 school year. The proposed budget for next year's driver education program is \$4,500, according to Raymond Hoe-

del, assistant superintendent for business.

SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS, while approving bill payments several weeks ago, complained of the hefty increase in car rentals and encouraged administration to seek alternate methods.

"This practice of charging rental fees has got to be the poorest piece of public relations that I'm aware of," said E.J. McClendon, former trustee. "Here's an excellent opportunity for the auto companies to get some good press when they're making record profits and having troubles pushing bills through Congress."

Marcia Borowski, new board president, said the car dealers instituted free rental service as a promotional gimmick, realizing youngsters who learned to drive would eventually enter the automobile market, and she saw no reason why the same ethics should not apply today.

"The parents in this community should write letters to their favorite car dealers chastising them for this rip-off," said Tom Yack, vice-president. Only Secretary Flossie Tonda expressed sympathy with the dealers and their need to make a profit.

Meier said he felt many persons were misinformed about the costs of

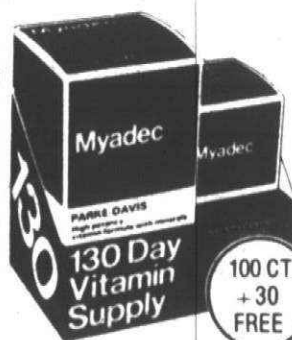

Mechanic snoozes on job, but nabs a thief

An auto repair shop employee foiled a robbery Saturday morning because he was sleeping on the job.

Working until 3 a.m. on an automobile, Donald Fletcher, an employee of Canton Auto and Radiator Repair, decided to sleep on a couch in a back room instead of heading home.

An hour-and-a-half later he heard the sound of breaking glass. Fletcher got up groggily and heard another sound—a car was being started.

When Fletcher got to the garage area he saw that a late model car was running. A young man got out and opened the service door. Fletcher ordered the man to halt.

"What he was thinking about I don't know," said Fletcher. "The door was blocked by the wrecker. He'd have been better off trying to steal the wrecker."

According to Wayne County Sheriff Det. Walt Holowka, Tim Alan Hendrickson, 18, of 8338 Weddel, Taylor, told police that he was looking for a car to siphon gas from to help out a man who had picked him up hitchhiking. Arrested for breaking and entering, Hendrickson said that the driver dropped him off at the repair shop and drove off with his sleeping bag.

Another employee at Canton Auto Repair said he happened to be driving east on Michigan about 4:30 a.m. Saturday when he noticed two men outside the business. He said he believes the pair saw they had been noticed

and drove off. He said he pursued the pair but lost them when they ran a stoplight.

Det. Holowka said that same night a 1974 Javelin parked at Michigan and Haggerty had its gas tank cut and pas-

senger window broken, in what could be a related incident.

Hendrickson was placed on a \$5,000 surety bond in 35th District Court. His examination is scheduled for today (Thursday).

renting cars to the dealer. "I don't think any of the dealers still providing cars at a cost are covering their overhead. Don't be surprised if all dealers stop offering cars for driver education use."

An additional hassle troubling car dealers is the difficulty of selling three-month-old driver training vehicles, according to DuCharme. Although most of the cars are in good shape, DuCharme said they carry a stigma with the general public and are much harder to peddle than standard models.

A LIST OF SUGGESTIONS to combat high prices is being weighed by school personnel to determine if there is a more feasible method to obtaining driver ed vehicles, Meier said.

One attractive alternative would be for the school district to purchase automobiles and then sell them back to the dealers for the same price. This would eliminate the interest loss suffered by dealers and shift the burden on the schools, Meier said.

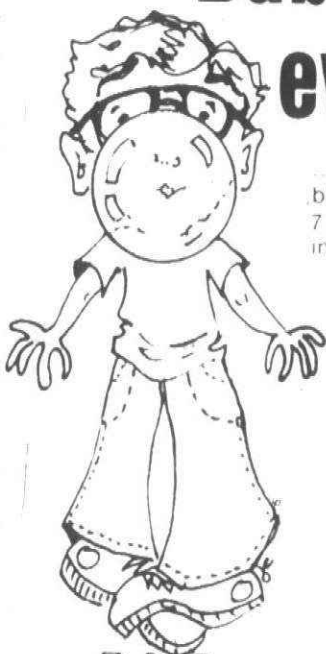

work to help the blind and other handicapped persons.

Until now, Mrs. Kuhn has been cooped in the house during the week while her husband is at work.

"During the week, I can't go anywhere, because I don't know anyone who can take me," Mrs. Kuhn said. "I just even like to go window shopping. I can't see much and it's mostly feeling, but at least I feel like I'm still communicating with the world."

"I think it's fantastic that they finally got this thing going," she said of the dial-a-ride program.

ALTHOUGH CANTON'S contract with NTC calls for limited dial-a-ride service in the township until later this summer, all eligible Canton residents will be able to use the service beginning this Monday because of a supplemental transportation service offered by the township.

Township-owned vans will transport

residents who live west of Canton Center from their doorsteps to NTC pick-up points at Meijer Thrifty Acres, the township firehall and the Canton recreation hall for no extra charge.

NTC vans will pick up residents of the township's eastern section, College Park and Wagon Wheel mobile home parks right at their doorsteps.

The dial-a-ride service is made possible by a six-month contract between Canton and NTC. Under terms of the contract, the township will pay NTC \$6 for each one-way trip taken by Canton residents and lease two of its vans to the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority for \$1 a year for NTC use.

At the end of six months, the township board and NTC will review Canton's participation in the program. At that time, both governing boards will decide if Canton should be a member in NTC with full voting power.

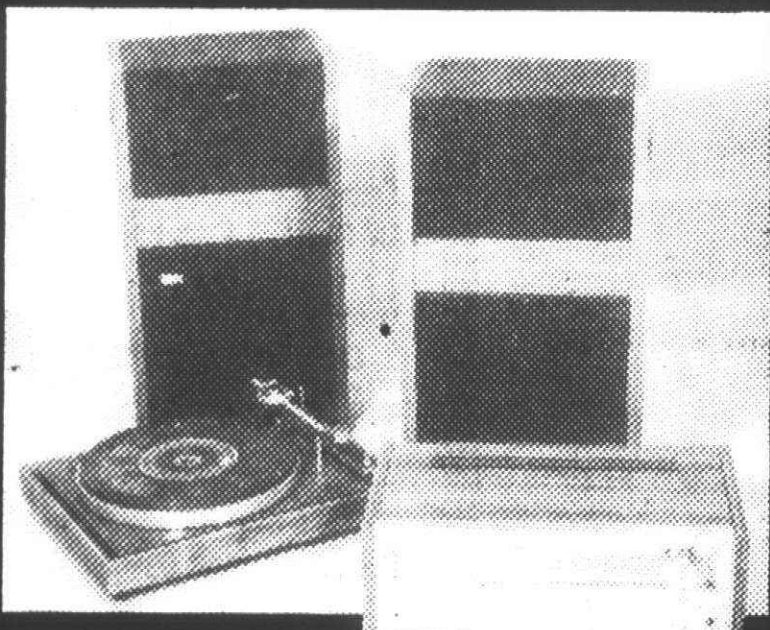

Commission OKs improvements for Old Village

Development of Cannon Park and construction of a gazebo in the Old Village area has been put forward by the city as a replacement for the aborted farmers' market project in downtown Plymouth.

The city commission a year ago had applied for federal funds, under the block grant program of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), to construct a farmers' market, including public restrooms, adjacent to the Penn Theatre. The farmers' market proposal, how-

ever, was turned down by HUD for not meeting federal requirements regarding the needs of low and moderate-income persons. The city administration had budgeted \$77,000 in its third-year community development program for the farmers' market, and had to find a substitute program for the federal dollars after the denial from HUD.

The Old Village proposal calls for a gazebo, planters, a parking lot with 18 spaces, and an area with a fountain, benches and brick walkway near the

Cannon Park area of Old Village. The improvements are expected to cost about \$65,000.

HUD already has approved \$10,000 for lighting in Old Village and another \$12,000 for sidewalk ramping and pedestrian improvements in the downtown area.

"Within the last month we reported to the city commission that the new secretary of HUD developed new guidelines and the farmers' market portion of our request had been denied," explained City Manager Fred

Yockey. "However, we still have the money if an acceptable alternate plan can be presented within a month or so."

"I have been working with the Old Village Association toward the development of a more comprehensive plan for Cannon Park and other appurtenances to Old Village."

"Because time is of the essence, I wanted to get some kind of indication from Wayne County that the Old Village plan would be an acceptable one. We met with the Wayne County Com-

munity Development Authority Advisory Council, presented the idea, and received a very enthusiastic acceptance of the proposal."

Yockey added that the county can approve the allocation for the Old Village improvements because the \$65,000 is less than 10 per cent of the county's total allocation from HUD.

The city commission voted 5-2 to spend the \$65,000 federal funds for the Old Village project, with Jack Moehle and Beverly McAninch voting no. Moehle argued the funds should be

used to aid individuals with their homes instead of being used for commercial-related properties in Old Village. Mrs. McAninch said she'd rather see the money used to begin a Dial-A-Ride program in the city.

In an earlier block grant program, the city had set aside funds for loans without interest for homeowners to renovate homes. The loan project, primarily aimed at Old Village residential areas, failed because of a lack of participation by residents who failed to apply for the loans.

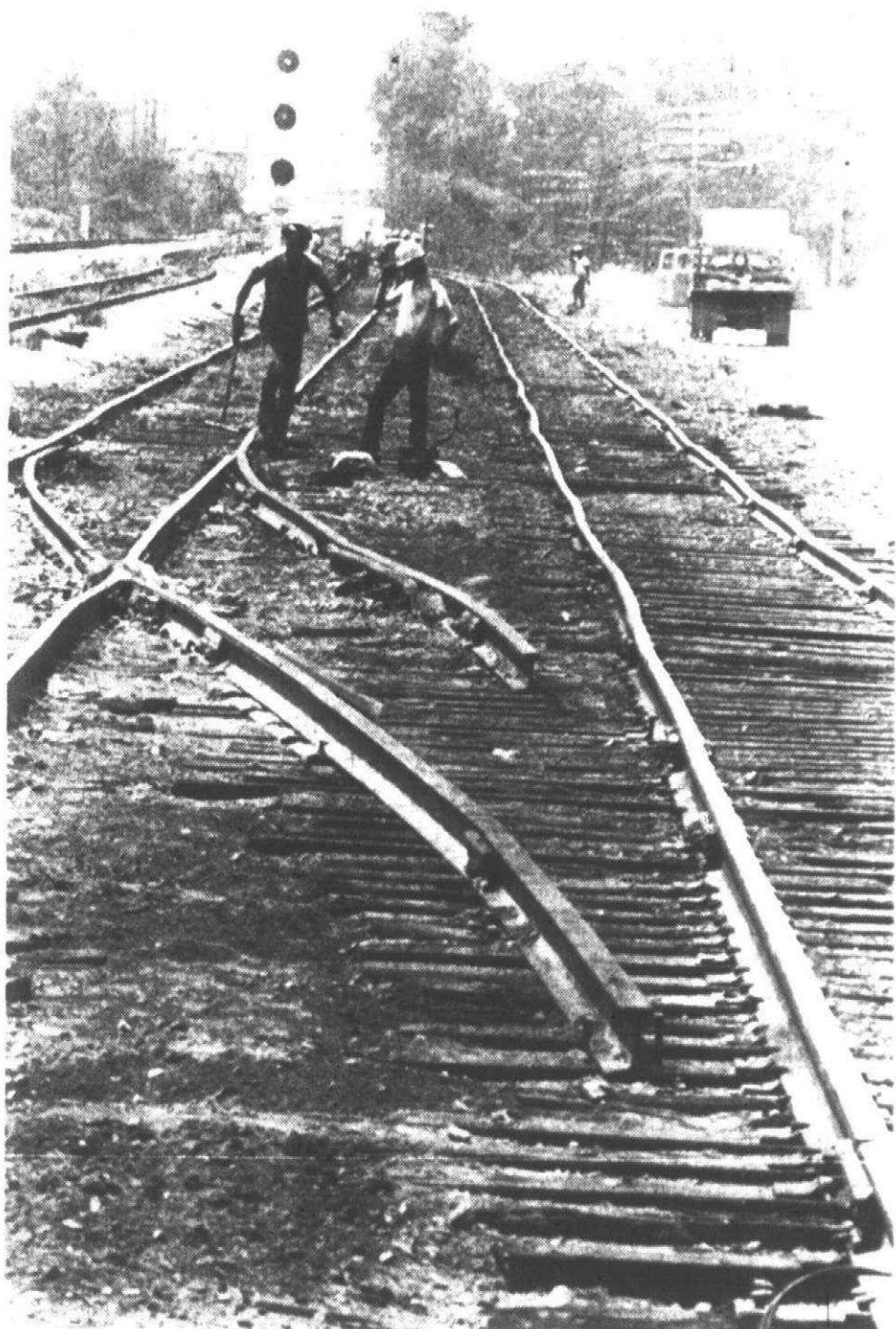

Mrs. Rossman recalls school

Pauline Rossman—the name brings fond memories for students and parents alike who gathered recently to honor her as she retired from her first grade teaching post at Tonquish Elementary School, 3345 Warren in Westland.

Numerous parents called the Westland Observer to tell us about how much Mrs. Rossman, a Plymouth resident, will be missed by them and their children.

Perhaps that's because Mrs. Rossman also shares in those fond memories of 15 years of teaching, 10 of them with the Nankin and Wayne-Westland school systems.

Mrs. Rossman grew up attending a one-room school house and, she adds, it was natural for her to begin her teaching career in a similar one-room school after attending a county normal school to obtaining the specialized training required.

That part of her career ended shortly with her marriage to a man who later became superintendent of the Plymouth district. While raising two sons, Mrs. Rossman attended Wayne State University to get her teaching degree.

Although she enjoyed teaching eight grades in one room, which meant doing her own custodial work such as lighting fires, washing floors and carting in water, Mrs. Rossman takes special pleasure in her first graders.

"First graders are very receptive and very eager. They're ready to lap up whatever you can teach them," she said. "It's fun to see them go out

of here reading."

Mrs. Rossman becomes involved in her teaching, compiling a personal library of more than 100 children's books so she can have her "own material at my fingertips," and making her own visual teaching aids.

"It takes a lot of time to teach first graders, but it's worth every minute of it," she continued. "I go home fatigued and just hit the couch. But I enjoy seeing them come in here babies and leave grown-up."

It's that same kind of involvement Mrs. Rossman urges parents to participate in, and she said parents have always been welcome to visit her classrooms.

"I've had a lot of parental support and that's half the battle," she said. "This is a nice, attendance area—people here support their schools."

"If there is no support from parents, it doesn't take children long to sense that, and that is reflected in their attitudes toward you (teacher)

and the school."

Mrs. Rossman is a teacher who makes her expectations known. "I'm firm and friendly, so I have a good rapport with the students," she said. "They know what my standards are and my limits. Children like the security of knowing what's expected of them."

As she begins her retirement, Mrs. Rossman finds that educational philosophies today are "nothing new. I get a kick out of the new philosophies of individualized, cross-age and cross-grade teaching. That's what we were doing years and years ago when I was teaching in the one-room school."

"So many parents are concerned about split-grade classes, but children out of rural systems often surpassed others because they heard the same lessons several times as they grew up. They were always tuned in to what was happening to others in the class. They learned a lot through absorption."

We have a little pain, so we take an aspirin. We feel depressed, so we take an anti-depressant, and so on," said Lawrence R. Krupka, professor of natural science at Michigan State University.

We keep trying to tune up our bodies like our automobiles, but no drug is perfectly safe.

The risks and benefits of individual drugs and the hazards of mixing drugs—whether bought on prescription or over-the-counter for "not feeling good"—were identified recently by the by the MSU biologist.

Krupka, who had done long-term studies of uses of prescription and non-prescription drugs by youngsters, college-age adults and the elderly, said Americans generally think of drugs as safe, and are unaware of the interactions resulting from mixing even commonly used drugs.

Data available, he told a session of the "summer university" of the MSU Alumni Assoc., shows that drug consumption far exceeds the known incidence of diseases in the U.S. Europeans and Japanese also have great reliance on pills.

He advocated that people tell their physicians what other drugs they are taking, ascertain whether the prescribed drugs are absolutely necessary, and what risk-benefit can be derived.

TO EXPLAIN the kinds of interaction possible among prescription and nonprescription drugs, Krupka cited a hypothetical Mrs. Smith, 39, suffering from a mild case of diabetes, arthritis which occasionally flares up and blood pressure problems. She has three active children, and a husband who wants her to share pre-dinner cocktails.

To "solve her problems," Krupka said, Mrs. Smith takes five prescription drugs ordered by her general practitioner, gynecologist and pediatrician. They are specific medicines for her diabetes, arthritis and blood pressure, a popular tranquilizer to help her get through her family day, and a birth control pill. In addition, she uses seven over-the-counter items, including aspirin, three kinds of vitamins, an occasional sleeping pill, alcohol, and anti-acid tablets.

Her birth control pill, said Krupka, aggravates her diabetes, increases her blood pressure, and alters her system's need for the kinds of vitamins she takes. The aspirin, for arthritis and head , interacts with vitamin C to induce stomach bleeding, while the anti-acid tablet's sodium level upsets the "low salt" diet designated by her physician to reduce her blood pressure.

In addition, the prescribed tranquilizer, the sleeping pill and the alcohol may combine for a lethal effect. Krupka recommended caution in driving while on prescription drugs which tend to "dull the mind."

Other "no-nos" cited by the MSU professor were:

•Don't mix aspirin with alcohol, anti-coagulants, or specific medicines for cancer, arthritis, diabetes or gout.

•Don't mix diuretics which combat fluid retention with anti-depressants, alcohol, cortisone-type drugs, blood pressure lowering drugs, or medication for diabetes or heart conditions.

•Don't mix sedatives, sleeping pills or tranquilizers with alcohol, anti-depressants, birth control pills or anti-histamines, Krupka said.

WSU women offer grants

Scholarships for women over 25 attending Wayne State University as part-time students are offered again this year by the Women of Wayne Alumni Association.

The tuition grants were established in 1966 to help women whose employment schedules or home responsibilities make full-time study impossible. A total of 145 women received awards in the first 10 years of the program.

Prior recipients include teachers, artists, a research engineer, co-owner of a handcrafted candle shop in Vermont, a public relations consultant and women in retail management, customer relations, occupational therapy, psychology, and work with senior citizens.

One is state coordinator for a refugee resettlement program, others are housewives or have returned to school for advanced degrees.

Applications are being considered now for fall through spring quarters. Forms are available at Alumni House, Wayne State University, Detroit, Mich. 48202.

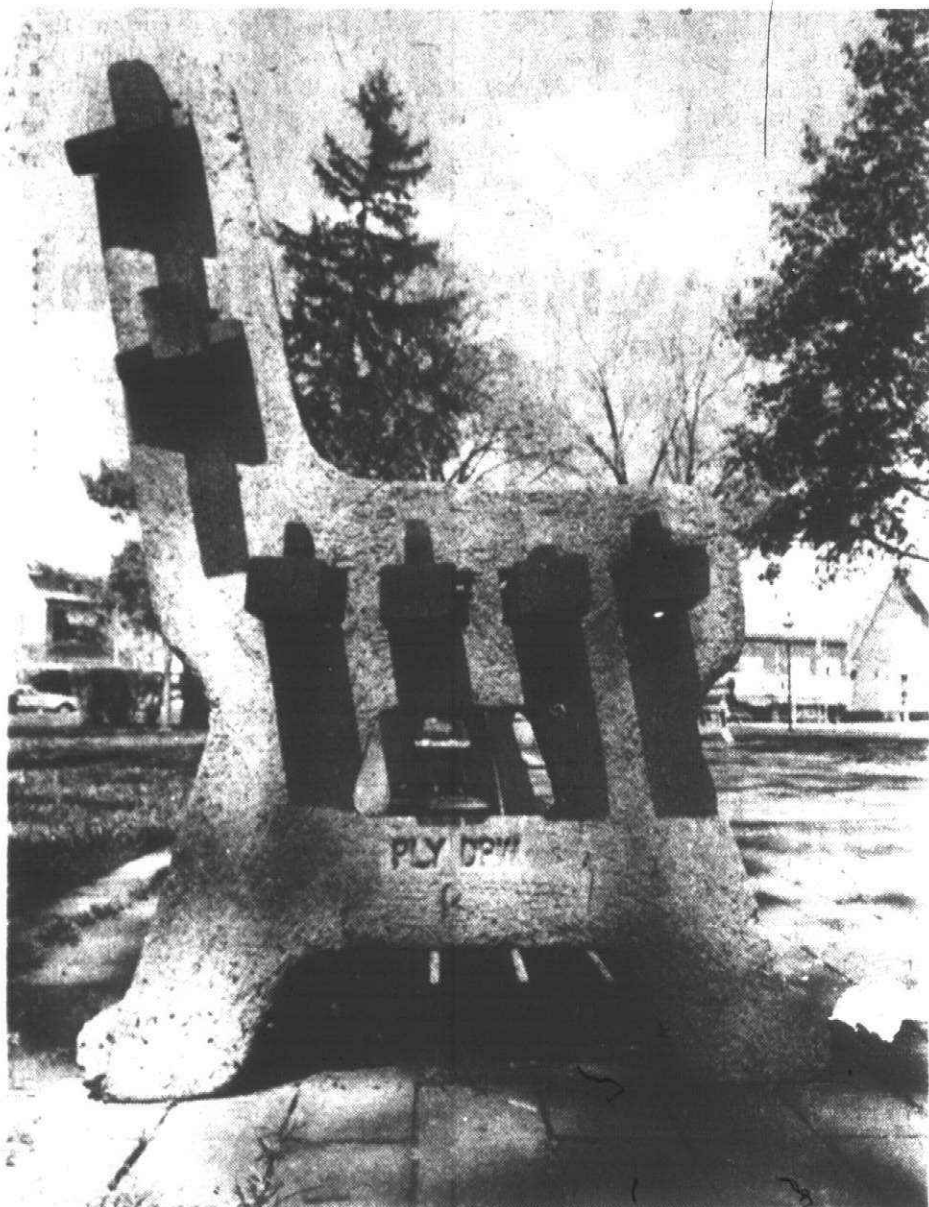

Leaders at confab

Mr. and Mrs. Gene Leader of Plymouth will be attending a golden anniversary banquet July 23 at the National Guard Armory, Lansing, to help observe 50 years of service of the Michigan Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Leader is a former commander of the Mayflower VFW Post in Plymouth while his wife, Helen, is a past president of the Plymouth VFW Auxiliary.

Vandalism in Kellogg?

Vandalism in downtown Plymouth, especially in Kellogg Park, has reached the point where Ken Vogras, head of the Public Works Department whose job it is to keep the area clean, is considering a curfew.

"It makes me sick at heart," he said, "when I take a look at the park in the mornings and see all the litter, cans, cardboard cartons and all manner of debris lying around on the ground."

"And it makes a fellow just wonder what is going on when the fountain in the center of the park is clogged with soap suds and it takes quite a while to clean it."

Vogras, who keeps a close eye on such things, pointed out that Wayne County has an 11 p.m. curfew in Hines Park and the groups that leave there come directly to Kellogg Park and carry on.

"What we really need," Vogras said, "is a patrolman on foot, just to keep the gangs under control and the park safe for the citizens. The police don't see much just driving around the park. It really takes some one to walk right in on them."

"We usually turn on the sprinkling system at 2 p.m.," he said, "and then the groups starts their vandalism by turning the faucets toward the street, and often on people sitting on the benches."

"And when they are not turning the

water on people they are raising havoc around the fountain or tossing frisbies all around the place."

In making his present request for a 10 p.m. curfew Vogras recalled that he is only repeating a request made 10 years ago when Mrs. Myrilla Schrader, then a top officer in a garden

club that was attempting to beautify the park.

"We asked for a curfew then," Vogras commented. "We didn't get it. But there is a lot more vandalism in the park and downtown area now. That's why a curfew is so sorely needed."

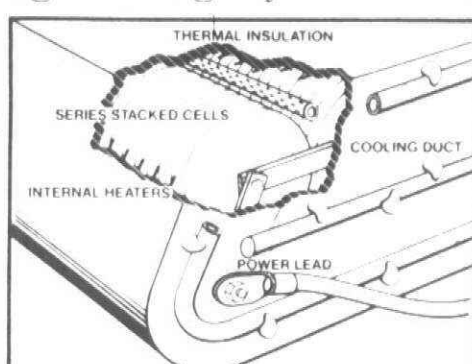

Bus the whole gang to area metropark

The Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA), the Detroit Department of Transportation, and the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority have teamed up to provide a "bargain bus service" to six area metroparks.

The project, funded by the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation, provides for \$1.10, round-trip individual fares when tickets are purchased in advance. Round-trip fares will be \$1.25 when purchased on the date of travel.

John Saunders, a SEMTA spokesman, said the metropark service operates from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. during the week. On Saturdays and Sundays, service will begin at 9 a.m. and run until 9 p.m.

Saunders said tickets are sold on a first-come, first-serve basis. They may be reserved by telephone. He said suburban residents may make

reservations by calling 581-4503.

Buses will make runs to Metropolitan Beach, Stoney Creek, Kensington, Lower Huron, Willow and Oakwoods metroparks. Buses will not run to Hudson Mills, Dexter-Huron and Delhi metroparks in Washtenaw county. Also Marshbank metropark on Cass Lake will not be included in the service.

Saunders suggested callers making telephone arrangements should specify their preferred days of travel, the number of people making the trip, their preferred time and place of pick-up, and which metropark they want to visit.

RESERVATIONS will be accepted subject to the availability of buses and bus drivers, Saunders cautioned.

In some instances, he said, groups traveling to the same metropark may be combined to fill as many bus seats as possible in order to serve as many people as possible.

Plastic surgeon favors certification

If you've been considering a facelift or a nose job, you may be one of many who were discouraged after watching a TV program depicting the horrors of cosmetic surgery performed by incompetent doctors.

The program, "Sixty Minutes," according to Dr. Richard Straith, a Southfield plastic surgeon, "scared a lot of people and nearly blew the lid off our profession."

"The TV documentary failed to show the results of capable, reputable cosmetic surgery," Straith maintained. "Unfortunately, there are too many doctors performing these operations who are unqualified."

"One of the problems is that the American Board of Plastic Surgery has never certified the technical competence of plastic surgeons. When the general public believes that it does, the resulting discrepancy contributes to anti-medical sentiment. This ill feeling is inflamed by other opinions."

Straith believes that written examinations conducted by the board for certification of plastic surgeons attest to their memories rather than their skills. He believes doctors in the field of aesthetic surgery should be graded by results.

"I HAVE suggested that the total ex-

amination by the board consist of short case reports with photographs of a minimum of 300 patients operated upon without supervision during the past two or more years," Straith said.

"I believe the board should also allow major plastic surgery privileges to all uncertified plastic surgeons who have assisted in a minimum of 900 cases. In a free society, the least possible number of restrictions consistent with public safety should be placed between any man and his efforts to practice his profession."

Straith Memorial Hospital, a 46-bed facility in Southfield, sponsors an annual cosmetic surgery symposium which is attended by physicians in all

parts of the country, Straith said. This year's session, he said, featured observations and discussions on facelifts, nose operations, breast augmentation and reduction and surgery performed on the abdomen, buttocks and thighs.

"We presented 10 years of unpublished improvements and refinements developed by our hospital and clinical staff," Straith said. "But a doctor who absorbs all the written material in the world and has no practical training won't be a good technician. Certification simply isn't synonymous with competency, the public is deceived and the results can be tragic."

COSMETIC SURGERY Straith contends, can be a necessity instead of an act of vanity in a number of instances. Women in their 40's and 50's who are divorced, widowed or must enter the job market for other reasons find they're competing with younger applicants.

"Not many employees hire 50-year-olds unless they look good," he maintained. "We're getting more and more men patients who call themselves 'recycled executives' after plastic surgery."

"All cosmetic surgeons get bad results once in a while. A three-hour facelift is like a three-hour symphony. If you miss a few beats or millimeters, the results are visible. But we have a lot more hits than misses and most of our patients are pleased with their 'happy surgery'."

Straith admits he's been subjected to a few malpractice lawsuits, but they're generally settled out of court. He's currently being sued by a woman who had a facelift and claims she lost the gleam in her eye. But, he added, he has corrected bad results caused by doctors who botched up their attempts at cosmetic surgery.

Some physicians perform plastic surgery in this office and aren't concerned about complications as long as they get their money before the operation, Straith said. Depending upon the extent of the surgery, the average cost is between \$1,000 and \$2,000, he said.

"As long as there's no such guarantee as certified competency, candidates for plastic surgery have to depend on referrals from other doctors or patients," Straith explained.

"The best way is to take your own survey by sitting in a plastic surgeon's office for an hour, observing results by watching patients and by talking to them about their doctor."

As Canton Township fills up, so do its sewers

Sewers have come up from the underground lately and become big news in western Wayne County generally and Canton Township specifically. First, there is the recent formation of an alternative authority—comprised of 16 western Wayne County communities—established to build the "super sewer" project through Wayne and Oakland counties.

Canton Supervisor Harold Stein is chairman of the new Huron Valley Wastewater System which is pushing for the sewer which will be separate from the system operated by the City of Detroit.

But the "super sewer" probably will not be in operation for at least 10 years, and Canton finds itself in the middle of a building boom right now.

Last week the Canton Township Board of Trustees said people who plan to buy lots in Canton for future development should be forewarned that sewer lines may be too full to allow them to enter the already-taxed system when they want to build a home on their lot.

After hearing from their attorney, Bert Burgoyne, that a planned "moratorium" on new sub-

division platting was illegal, board members hoped that the building boom might be slowed if buyers and developers heard the threat that platted land may turn out to be undevelopable.

Board members drafted a resolution that asks developers to inform prospective lot buyers in writing that connections to sewers may not be available in the future.

Two of Canton's major developers—Howard Binkow and Richard Lewiston—say they know nothing of this new resolution, let alone any people who might buy a subdivision lot.

After being read the resolution, Lewiston said it sounds like the statement changes nothing. It's business as usual.

The recent resolution is hardly the remedy people in Canton are demanding to ease the staggering influx of new homes which contain new people who need municipal services.

Contrary to Burgoyne's opinion, we believe a temporary halt of new subdivision platting approvals could be accomplished legally by the board if a specified period of time is set. This respite would allow Canton planners time to draw up a

firm zoning map and a final, workable master plan for land use.

Burgoyne doesn't think any "moratorium" would be legal if it is contingent on the availability of sewer capacity.

But there's more than one way to skin a cat and more than one legal delaying tactic to curb the rate of development.

The township should be willing to face developers in court, if necessary, to enter a sound argument about the pressure being placed on sewers, services and schools because of the recent rate of residential growth.

If it will make the township attorney or the developers any happier, don't use the word "moratorium." Call it a time-out to allow the township time to pass a zoning ordinance to go along with the master plan.

The Canton Board of Trustees should not take its attorney's advice as gospel. While Burgoyne has provided excellent direction on zoning law, he

is still offering an opinion, he should not be dictating direction.

Trustee Brian Schwall said recently: "If we're going to go on record as advocates of growth management, shouldn't we have an attorney who agrees with the concept? If I were fighting a liberal cause, I'd hire a William Kunstler or a Ramsey Clark."

In typical bureaucratic fashion, next Tuesday the Canton board will discuss whether it should pay Burgoyne to go back to his lawbooks and try to come up with a legal avenue to control growth. We're not optimistic.

With a background of advising developers, Burgoyne is no champion of radical approaches to growth management.

A more dynamic approach to the growth problem is needed. Right now the approach seems to be "let the builders and the sewers regulate growth." This attitude is not conducive to good planning.

School enrollment report offers little encouragement

Is the elementary school in your neighborhood being closed? Is enrollment in your school district dwindling, requiring layoffs among teachers? Has the reduced enrollment produced cutbacks in state support for your local school system?

There are very few parents in this area who cannot answer at least one of these questions with a troubled, "Yes."

Just why this is so is contained in a recently published report on Michigan's school enrollment decline, which was prepared for the state department of education by a special task force, including George Garver, superintendent of the Livonia school system, and John C. Raeside, president of the Redford Union school board.

The report has received very little publicity, mostly because it is long, thorough, and complex. But the facts it sets forth are explosive in their impact on our local school system.

MICHIGAN'S school enrollment has come in waves of population. The big one came with the baby boom peak in 1957, which rolled through the schools as the children grew up: in 1962-63 it hit kindergarten schools; in 1971-72 it passed through upper middle school grades (7-9); it smacked into senior high school grades in 1975-76; and now it has passed through the K-12 school system entirely.

Although there was a small increase in births registered in 1969-70, which will generate a small "wavelet" through the schools, any substantial baby boom in the foreseeable future seems unlikely. Nationwide, the fertility rate has dropped from a post World War II high of 3.8 children per woman in 1957 to a current record low of 1.8.

Since 1945, Michigan's public school enrollment has grown enormously, doubling by 1963-64, and reaching a peak of 2,141,761 pupils in 1971-72. But beginning in 1964-65, statewide enrollment started slipping; up to now, more than 115,000 fewer students are enrolled in the public schools than in the record years.

What does this mean?

Based on population projections, we can foresee with a fair degree of accuracy that:

- Michigan's schools in grades 7-12 will lose 20 per cent of their present enrollment from 1975 to 1984, when the schools will be educating nearly 185,000 fewer children than they do today.
- Elementary schools will suffer a similar loss of enrollment over the coming decade, dropping by more than 230,000 pupils.

This is the first time in recent Michigan history that we can predict a substantial drop in school enrollment.

SO, YOU might ask, what does this mean? It means trouble for local school finances, in two ways.



First, for each lost pupil, each local school district loses more than \$1,000 in state aid, owing to the way the state aid formula is presently computed. If a district loses 10 pupils, it loses nearly \$11,000—enough to hire one beginning teacher.

Can local districts lay off teachers to cut back on expenses to meet reduced state aid payments? Not really, because the costs of running a school system do not drop proportionately with enrollment.

Which leads to the second problem for local districts: To meet the state aid shortfall, they'll have to close more schools. The report estimates that the overhead costs of keeping one average elementary school open are something more than \$66,000 per year.

The report concludes that additional state aid to local districts will be needed to offset the impact of declining enrollment, but that even with added state help, other methods will have to be found to offset the increased per pupil cost caused by fewer pupils. "The closing of individual school buildings will become an increasing—and perhaps only—possibility as enrollment continues to decline. . . (but) it is one thing to close a neighborhood elementary school; it may be quite another to close a senior high school."

BUT THAT isn't all.

Reduced enrollment will require teacher layoffs—14,600 are estimated by 1981—or drastic increases in teacher/pupil ratios leading to reductions in educational quality.

And because younger teachers will be the first to be laid off, "Michigan's pupils will be taught by teachers who each year are further away from their preparation."

Lastly, the report suggests that it may be necessary to further reorganize Michigan's 530 school districts. That means the possibility of consolidations of local districts into "super districts," and the corresponding reduction in their closeness to the local community.

It's a gloomy picture that the report paints, but at least it gives all of us—local school officials, teachers, and parents—a chance to see what looms on the horizon.

Solutions will not be easy, but it's better to know they'll be required than to be surprised.



Unskilled may suffer from increase in minimum wage

Unemployment in the nation went back up to 7.1 per cent last month. It had fallen below 7 per cent for two months in a row.

The interesting part is that there are now more heads of households employed than ever before in the history of the nation.

Why then did unemployment go up? As discussed in other columns, it is because more people who haven't been in the job market before want jobs.

Noticeable among these new job seekers are younger women who are now career minded, who in the old days would not have been interested in working; older women who are coming back into the job market after raising their children; and youths entering the job market for the first time, most of whom are unskilled.

Most of the job seekers pushing up the statistics have never before been gainfully employed on a full-time basis.

At the same time that the unemployment rate is going back up, labor unions are pressuring congress and the president to increase the minimum



wage from \$2.30 to \$3.00 an hour.

This week the president compromised by saying he would support an increase to \$2.65. He previously felt that \$2.50 an hour was as high as he would go. This would bring a 40-hour weekly paycheck to \$106 from \$92.

There are very few union members currently earning the minimum wage, so it should be of little concern to them.

THE JOBS that pay the minimum wage are jobs that require the least training or experience. They are the marginal jobs. They are added in good times and dropped in bad times.

As the minimum wage goes up, employers have to weigh whether they need these employees. If checkout boys at a supermarket cost too much, the supermarket hires fewer of them. If the cost gets too high, car washes add extra blowers and cut their employees.

Thus there is a basic conflict. The higher the minimum wage goes, the fewer the opportunities for unskilled labor.

Yet the fewer the jobs, the more unemployment goes up. Every time unemployment rises there is pressure to create new federally subsidized jobs, because the alternative is spending more money on welfare.

The minimum wage was enacted originally to prevent the worker from being exploited. At the time most families in America had only one working member and if he couldn't earn a decent living, the family would have been a burden on society.

Today, all that has changed because of the number of families in which both the members work.

Until there is full employment in this nation we should be doing everything we can to create new jobs. And the creation of new skilled jobs won't solve our unemployment problem because the skilled worker is already working today.

Raising the minimum wage will only decrease the number of unskilled jobs available, deny opportunity to those who want to enter the job market and help maintain a high level of unemployment.

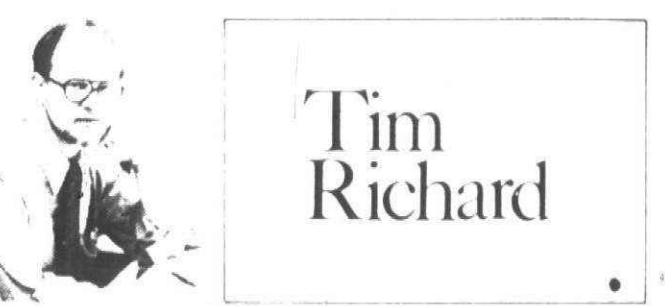
'To see ourselves as others see us'

A Philadelphia newspaper, to raise funds for a charity, conducted a special showing a few years ago of "The Front Page," where Jack Lemmon plays a beat reporter and Walter Matthau the hard-boiled editor. The movie follows Ben Hecht's play about coverage of a murder trial in the 1920s.

Afterwards, the story goes, the newspaper executives were asked how realistic they considered "The Front Page," and to a man they laughed it off as good entertainment with little relation to real life.

Their wives were asked the same question and found the movie an excellent portrayal of how their husbands make a living.

One immediately thinks of the Robert Burns line—"to see ourselves as others see us."



the book doesn't mention at all. They want to find some way to make the article interesting and make people want to read it."

We blushed a bit at reading how we admitted to lack of time to do backgrounding—but it's true.

SHE MADE NOTE of my use of the repetition technique—"when you (interviewer) repeat back to the person what he said."

"This serves two purposes. First, it lets you know whether or not you grasp what the interviewee said. Second, it gives the interviewee confidence that his information is being recorded correctly."

Her teacher was fascinated when Barbara reported: "Usually during the interview, a high point will be reached, probably around the 20-minute mark. After this, it starts going down." In the margin, the instructor asked, "Why?" I don't know why. It just happens that way. The best information comes about 20 minutes after the opening.

Miss Turnbull gave a whole paragraph to a technique I picked up in an anthropology class: "What he does is follow the person in a certain situation, usually his job, and observes what he says and does. He asks only clarifying questions. The natural language of the person is heard. . . (giving) the feel of the person's system of values and his 'real' thing."

MARGARET MILLER breaks down interviews into types: "In the information type, she asks specific questions. In the general one, she talks to the person, employing the conversation technique."

None of us, Miss Turnbull found, know shorthand. We take notes by a blend of abbreviations, simplified spellings, key words and memory.

I enjoyed learning Sherry Kahan's technique because, in the four years I've known her, Sherry never told me about it. As she interviews from carefully prepared questions, Miss Turnbull wrote, Mrs. Kahan mentally looks for her angle, the point that makes this story different.

"Some ways to achieve this are by using colorful details, telling what something looks like, setting a scene or describing a person. However, sometimes she won't get her angle until she has her 'foot in the door' and then the interviewee says something striking."

It was a strange sensation—being the source of a written paper rather than the author. Now I know how some of you folks feel when my fellow newsmen and I come at you, notebooks in hand.

A meal is more than food; exploit all the senses

All the feelings, all emotions and all sensations are ultimately located in the brain. An idea becomes reality. Never underestimate the power of suggestion. Attitude and atmosphere are all important.

Wise ones know that the serving of the right food under the right conditions can produce any emotion or action they may desire.

A well-planned meal (for any purpose) is one that will bring all the senses into play, not just the sense of taste. Visual appeal, aroma, and varying textures and consistencies, all play a part in deciding the total effect.

Here are a few helpful hints for setting the stage:

1. ALWAYS USE cloth table coverings and napkins. Today, with permapress fabrics, even the busiest (or laziest) person has no excuse for not using them. They require no starching or ironing, and are cheaper than paper in the long run.



But unless cost is no factor in your case, I would suggest that you make your own. That way, you can afford many sets, and may always choose exactly what you want for each occasion.

Buy fabric from remnant counters, cut to desired sizes, and hem or fringe the edges.

In choosing colors, remember their psychological value. Choose carefully: red for romance; ivory or beige for a proposal; bright clear greens, yellows, and chocolate browns to encourage friendships; patterns, checks, and earthy colors to inspire domesticity; etc.

All napkins should be enormous in size, unless the meal being served is for the purpose of cooling a friendship. Then use extra small ones. Conventional-sized napkins are best when you are working on business deals.

2. ALWAYS HAVE fresh flowers on the table. They need not be expensive.

During the winter, use house plants, or cuttings from house plants. Or buy a single flower. It is worth the small investment to have a single rose in a vase when you are trying to raise one's spirits or promote romance.

3. Use candle light for all meals. Forget the old rule of only after six o'clock.

I use drippy candles in bottles, or novelty candles in various shapes, even for breakfast, or lunch alone with one child. It makes each meal a special occasion.

Some men are afraid of candle light. If your man says: "I like to see

what I'm eating," or is obviously uncomfortable in a too romantic setting, use candles anyway, but use them subtly, with other soft indirect light.

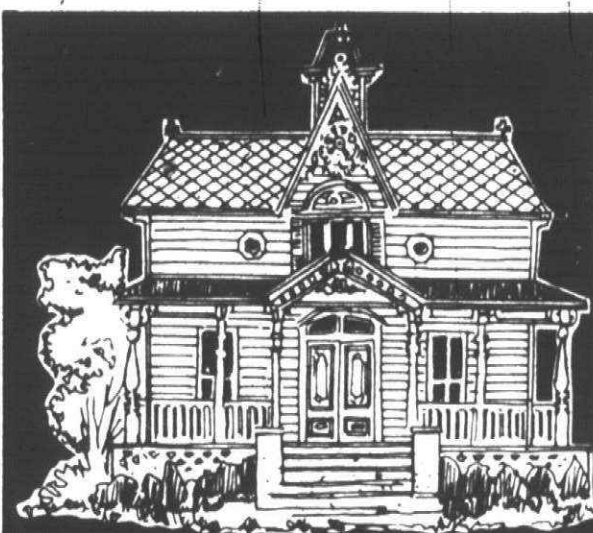
4. ALWAYS USE appropriate background music. But remember that the music should provide a soft background, and not be the main event.

It should blend into the total atmosphere so that it is barely noticed, if at all.

5. Choose china, silverware and glassware carefully. Add your own personal touch here and there. Don't be afraid of breaking conventional rules.

Give these five things thought with every meal you serve, even the slightest snack. You will find that it does make a difference.

Area drama students combine talents for 'Wizard of Oz'

It was the first dress rehearsal of the "Wizard of Oz" in Wayne Memorial High School Auditorium. From the number of familiar faces in the cast and crew, it could have been the local high school auditorium.

Gloria Logan, drama coach at Plymouth Centennial Educational Park was directing the musical. Her husband, Norman Logan, was in the pit directing the orchestra made up of teachers and students.

The cast is composed of area high school and college students who have starred in high school and college productions.

Linda Dwyer has the role of Dorothy. She had leads in many high school plays and her dramatic talents earned her an Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents Scholarship for the Dramatic Arts.

At Eastern, her performances have included The Girl in "The Fantasticks" and most recently, Pauline in Neil Simon's "Prisoner of Second Avenue."

Linda, now a junior at EMU, got her first taste of theatre as a preschooler. Her mother, Marilyn Dwyer, always was involved in the annual children's play presented by the Plymouth branch American Association of University Women. A very young Linda attended rehearsals with her mother and had an early indoctrination to the many phases of a theatrical production.

CHARLIE BURR, a 1975 graduate of Plymouth Canton high is the scarecrow.

He was active in the drama department of PCEP for three years where he is best remembered for his show-stopping performance as Moonface Martin in "Anything Goes."

He was awarded a Board of Regents Scholarship for Dramatic Arts to EMU where he performed in the five-hour production of O'Neill's "Mourning Becomes Electra" and as Rosencrantz in "Hamlet."

Burr has directed at both high school and EMU. His most recent production was "Portraits of Myself" which he wrote, directed and in which he performed.

As the Scarecrow in the "Wizard of

Oz," Burr sings, dances and plays the role to the hilt.

LISA GRIMM, another of Gloria Logan's products at PCEP, is the Wicked Witch of the West.

Lisa is a June graduate of Plymouth High and has been involved in drama for three years. She played Katrin in "I Remember Mama" and did the choreography for "Guys and Dolls."

She will attend the University of Ohio in the fall on a drama scholarship.

There is no resemblance to idealistic Katrin in Lisa's performance of the witch. Her long pointed nose and chin and her shrill hateful voice are a wicked combination.

MATT WATROBA, the Cowardly Lion, will be a senior next fall at Plymouth High.

He played Simon in "David and Lisa" on the Canton stage and Nicely Nicely Johnson in "Guys and Dolls" on the PSHS stage.

Todd Barker, another June graduate of Plymouth High is Tibia and mayor of the Munchkins.

Todd was a 1977 winner of the EMU Board of Regents scholarship for dramatic arts. He was awarded the first Plymouth Community Arts Council's scholarship and displayed his mime talents as the Jester in the arts council's follies, "Jest Foolin'."

During his high school years he had roles in "I Remember Mama," "Guys and Dolls," and "Once Upon a Mattress." He also performed in Burr's "Portraits of Myself."

Harry Bott, a senior at PSHS in the fall, is Joe the farmhand in the "Wizard." He appeared in the children's show "The Clock that Went Meow" at Canton High.

His brother, Bill Bott, is one of the Munchkins. Bill will be a freshman at PSHS this fall.

Cheryl Collins, a June graduate of Plymouth High, has two roles in the musical. She is a Munchkin and the old lady who beats on the lion.

Cheryl has been involved in the theater during her four years in high school and played Sarah Brown in "Guys and Dolls."

She plans to attend Madonna College.

A BREAK IN rehearsal was time for a consultation between the director and the lighting engineer.

Just to round out Plymouth's contribution to the City of Wayne's summer theater production, Jim Kaiser descended from the projection booth. Jim has been Gloria's lighting expert on all her productions in Plymouth Salem High School auditorium.

"We have only three weeks to put the show together," said Mrs. Logan. "This is the first night we have been in the auditorium. We have been rehearsing in a Catholic church."

Monday night's dress rehearsal gave every promise of polished professional performance when the show opens Friday evening.

There will be three performances in Wayne Memorial High School Auditorium, Glenwood at Fourth in Wayne. Curtain time is 8 p.m. July 22 and 23, and 3 p.m. Sunday, July 24.

Tickets for the "Wizard of Oz" are available at the door or Wayne City Hall. Prices are \$2.50 for adults, \$1.50 for senior citizens, and \$1 for students.

THE SUMMER theater is a first for the City of Wayne.

"It is funded by the city and is part of the summer festival celebration," said Tom Daily, assistant city manager.

He explained that the city council voted to allocate \$4,250 toward the summer theater project. The "Wizard of Oz" will be the only production. The 80 members of the crew and cast are volunteering their time and talents.

"Any revenue from the musical will be deducted. The council hopes to recoup about half. We estimate the cost will be about \$2,000."

Producers David Carrick and Rodger Nicholson hope the program will be continued next year.

The auditorium seats about 1,200 persons and is just east of the high school. With a full house for every performance, it could be a money-maker for the city.

And it should draw large audiences. The caliber of the actors, the music, sound effects and sets is exceptional.

The Munchkins are amazing. The little people scoot around the stage seated on little square boxes with wheels on each corner. Their costumes are constructed in such a way that the boxes are completely covered by their long skirts.

The wicked witch descends from the skies and the audience will see one of the prettiest snowstorms they have ever observed—on stage or off.

2d Opportunity House to open

The bride graduated from Plymouth Salem High School in 1974. Her husband earned his BS degree from the University of Western Ontario in London. He is a lieutenant in the Canadian Armed Forces and earned his wings shortly before the wedding.

Phase Two in the implementing of a longtime dream will begin Sunday, July 24, when the Community Opportunity Center (COC) organization breaks ground for a Redford Township home for retarded citizens.

The community is invited to the 2 p.m. groundbreaking on the property, on the east side of Beech two blocks north of Six Mile.

The new facility will house 16 retarded adults in a family-type situation like the one enjoyed for nearly two years by residents of Plymouth Opportunity House.

Like the Plymouth house, located on Deer Street, the Redford home will be funded through a state program and operated on rent to be paid by the residents with money they get from jobs or participation in sheltered workshops.

Also, like Plymouth house, operation will be in the hands of a COC-appointed director, with house-parents providing warmth and wisdom for everyday living situations. Social workers and a secretary also will be involved with the residents.

And even as construction begins on

the Redford home, the Community Opportunity Center group is working on Phase Three, a home in Livonia for some retarded adults in that area.

Property for the Livonia residence is being sought, and down the road the COC is making long-range plans to continue its efforts in Garden City and Northville.

JAN PLAS, COC president, said construction of the Redford house is expected to take four to six months to complete and he hopes to have it occupied by next January.

"We are in the process of selecting residents and hiring the staff for the home," he stated.

Architect William Lindhout and construction firm head Ed Orr, a duo that combine efforts for Plymouth Opportunity House, will join efforts again for the Redford venture.

Lindhout, who drew plans for the Redford building even before state financing was approved, said this one would be one-story because a larger piece of land was available and thus would be able to realize some construction savings because safety features required by the two-story

Plymouth house will not be needed.

The Redford property is just north of the playground of Our Lady of Loretto Catholic church, and parking will be available in the church lot for the groundbreaking.

Plas said a fund-raising drive will soon be launched for money to furnish the Redford home when it is completed.

Many community groups joined in the furnishing of Plymouth Opportunity House, and that initial contact has brought a number of volunteers to continue their contacts with the residents and assist in their programs.

THE IDEA for centers where the retarded could live in dignity has been developing for more than a decade, and it was in 1964 that the Community Opportunity Center, a non-profit housing corporation, was formed as an offshoot of the Northwest Communities Association for Retarded Citizens.

The COC developed figures showing that retarded persons living and working in such settings could be housed at considerably less expense than in other government-operated programs,

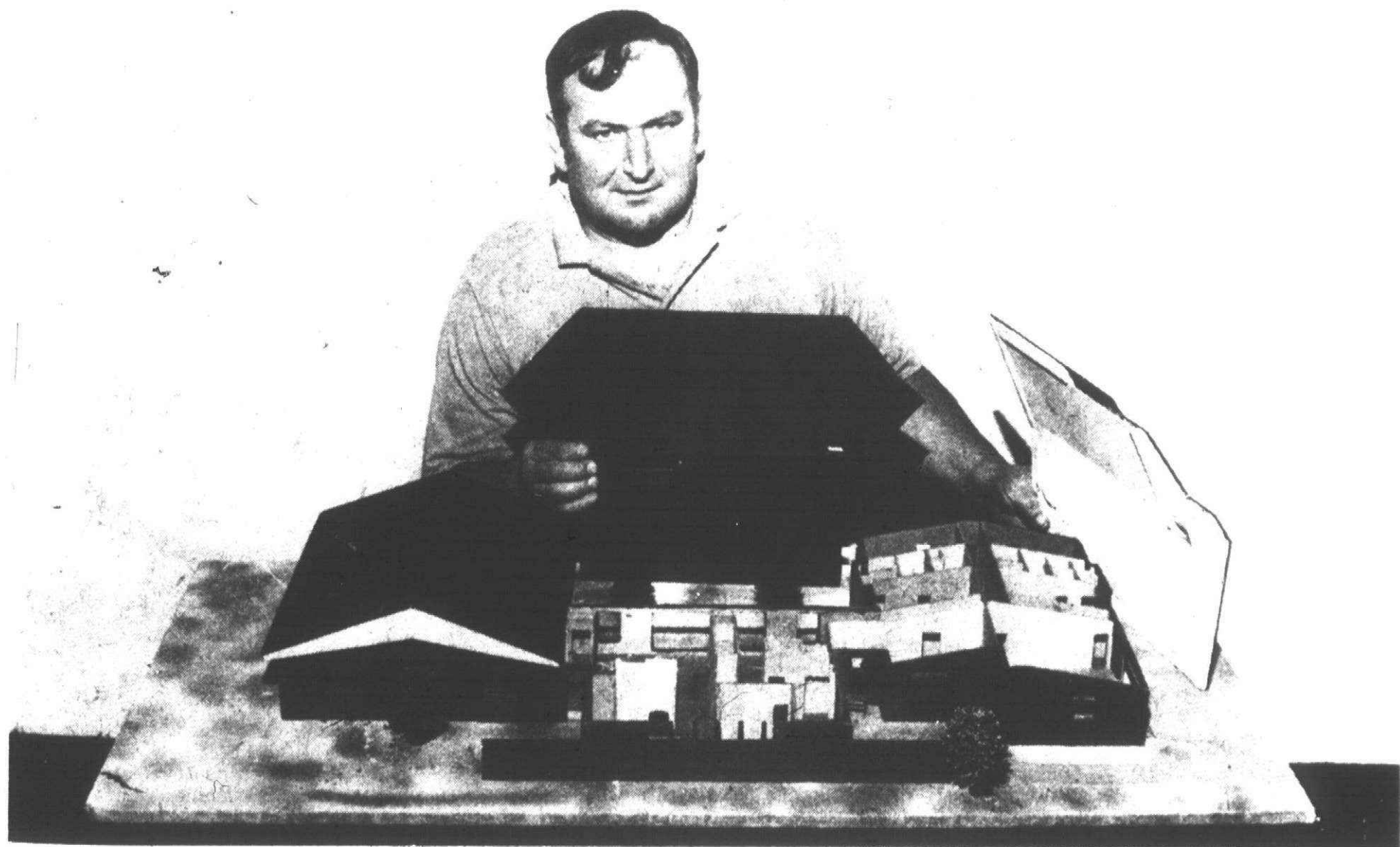
even when they used Supplemental Security Income from the state for their rental payments. Many hold jobs and are self-supporting.

In the past decade, the Michigan Department of Social Services and its program—titled Residential Facilities for the Mentally Retarded—has completed 18 homes, including the one in Plymouth. The new building in Redford is part of a second phase in that program.

In many areas, Plas said, there has been a need to overcome objections of residents to the building of a home for retarded, but once the homes are established the residents have become well-accepted members of the community. In Plymouth, a number of neighbors have become regularly involved with the activities of the house.

Residents of the Redford home will be selected by a specially appointed committee from applications from the area.

Those selected must be capable of semi-independent living and must be able to work in jobs or sheltered workshops.

Liquid happiness? Can be 100 proof disaster

It may look like liquid happiness at first to some women, but frequently it turns out to be that 100-proof disaster called alcoholism.

Why women opt for hoisting the bottle was recently discussed by Dr. Edith Gomberg, a University of Michigan professor, in testimony before a U.S. Senate committee hearing on alcoholism in females.

"We believe there are kinds of disruptive early life experiences which produce a vulnerable person," stated Dr. Gomberg, a professor in the sociology department. "These experiences could include living in a family in which there has been divorce, death, desertion, alcoholism and psychiatric illness."

"This produces a woman who has great difficulty trusting others and in forming healthy interdependent relationships."

"SHE CARRIES THESE problems into adolescence with her. As an adolescent, she wants terribly to be liked by others, but her adolescence is likely to be stormy, conflict-ridden and painful."

"As the mating season begins, she joins the game with intensity and she is overtly, on the surface a very feminine young lady. But under the hyperfemininity is a resentful young woman."

In the opinion of Dr. Gomberg, no marriage can possibly live up to the fantasies of this vulnerable, hyperfeminine young lady.

"Sometimes, when the marriage fails, she goes out and finds a job, and starts drinking there," she indicated. "Sometimes she stays home and drinks."

"She finds in alcohol a friend who is always there, always dependable, available when she wants it without delay, and a source of disturbance to people around her. It gets everyone annoyed and upset, worried and angry."

"With that potent a weapon to fight back at a frustrating world, it is a wonder we don't have more women alcoholics than we do."

The speaker stated that this vulnerable woman who has begun problem drinking is someone whose "conflicts about femininity are buried deep and not easily resolved by taking a job."

She pointed to the fact that industrial programs for troubled employees show "quite a high rate of drinking problems among women workers."

WHAT ELSE is involved in the woman's turn toward heavy drinking?

Models, for one thing. The woman finds models for her behavior in the bosom of her family, her parents, her siblings, or her husband.

"Women seem to catch alcoholism from their husbands much more readily than men catch alcoholism from their wives," noted Dr. Gomberg. "The vulnerable lady is much more likely to turn into an alcoholic if her husband is one, or her father, mother, sister or brother."

According to Ben Warner of the National Council on Alcoholism of Greater Detroit Area, females develop this disease quicker than men. "They don't realize what is going on," he observed. "Then, too, women have less body fluid, which means the alcohol is not diluted as much as it is in men, so they feel the effect quicker."

He too believes that the conflict in roles is what helps make women alcoholic.

"Masculinity has been spelled out so long, that when she assumes a masculine role, it makes her think something is wrong," he said.

They feel guilty, he noted, and this is the first problem he tries to deal with when counseling alcoholics.

DR. GOMBERG ALSO felt it important to shed some light on the so-called "sly, evasive and sneaky" woman who drinks at home.

"Drinking alone is more characteristic of women alcoholics than of men," she said. "We think she is a lone drinker for two very good reasons."

"She drinks at home because that's her place of employment. It's where she lives and works and where she spends her day. Another reason for it is the attitude of society toward this problem as manifested by women."

She pointed out that whenever attitudes are studied, it emerges quite clearly that everybody disapproves of drunkenness in women more than they disapprove of it in men.

"This differential in attitude seems to be universal, she said. "People will be sympathetic, amused or pitying toward a drunken male. Attitudes toward an intoxicated woman are quite different."

"It is hardly surprising considering this universal disapproval, distaste and rejection, that women with drinking problems try to keep their drinking at home."

THERE ARE OTHER grim kinds of behavior that are symptomatic among women with alcoholic problems. Dr. Gomberg listed them as depression, attempted suicide and use of drug substances other than alcohol.

She explained that depression is regarded as a more common psychiatric complaint among alcoholic women than men. But she questions this concept.

"It is more acceptable within the sexual role for women to be downcast, sad, despairing and crying, and I wonder if there is not as much depression among men, nonalcoholic and alcoholic alike, as there is among women but manifested somewhat differently."

However, there is little differences in what brings both male and female alcoholics to helping facilities. Generally it is a crisis.

"But we think that women are most often precipitated into an agency or facility because of a family crisis," she observed. "Sometimes she is driven by concern for the children, their neglect, social ostracism, or even an outright threat to remove them from her. With an unmarried woman, it may be a response to the despair and anger of parents, siblings, or significant other people in her life."

Once in treatment, like the man, the woman will need detoxification.

"It also is a good idea to emphasize a program of nutrition and preventative measures, and work at maintaining these health measures," she said. "A cautious, conservative approach in prescribing any drug therapy is certainly in order."

AMONG THE METHODS of therapy for this woman Dr. Gomberg suggested conjoint family therapy, a suggestion which Richard Weston, takes to heart in the alcoholism program he heads at Metropolitan Hospital West in Westland.

"Sometimes the marriage is beyond rescue, and the women will need a great deal of support in group and individual therapy in restructuring her life," she indicated.

"Alternatives to marriage and the one-parent family are more acceptable than they were a generation ago, but it is my bias that marriages should be preserved if possible."

"A woman on her own may be a more socially acceptable phenomenon now but it is still a lonely life. Women who become alcoholic are often isolated and lonely women who need family life."



She also suggested assertiveness training for the women and a therapeutic program for her children to help them with the problems their mother's alcoholism has brought them.

"Such a program for the children in alcoholic families is a first line of prevention because we do know from all the studies that children are vulnerable to alcoholism," she said. "They are a high risk group."

Dr. Gomberg concluded her re-

marks to the senators by telling them how best to judge the success of the treatment given.

With male patients, counselors look at his work record, days missing and accident reports as well as at his family and social life. With a woman, they look first at her relationships within her family, her husband, parents and children.

"This is, for most of our women clients, a primary measure of her recovery," she said.

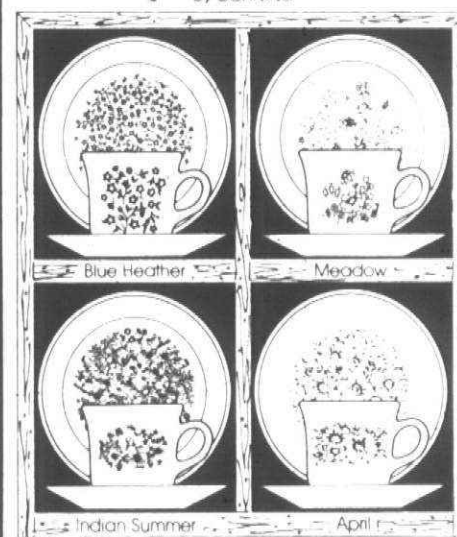

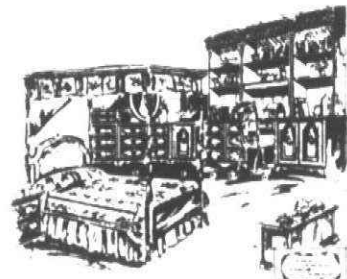

Peaches early

"Get there early if you want fresh peaches this year," advises Glen Antle, Michigan State University Extension marketing agent.

Red Haven peaches, one of the most widely grown varieties for eating fresh, and for freezing and canning, are ready for harvest around July 20—two weeks earlier than average.

Red Havens usually ripen around Aug. 5-10, but those dates do not hold true in 1977. Whether you pick your own or shop at roadside or supermarkets for the delectable fruit, be aware of the early harvest start and subsequent early finish.

The Red Haven peach crop this year is of excellent quality, and Michigan is the only state in the Midwest to boast a full crop—USDA estimates are 1.4 million bushels.

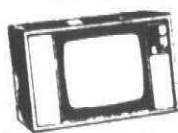

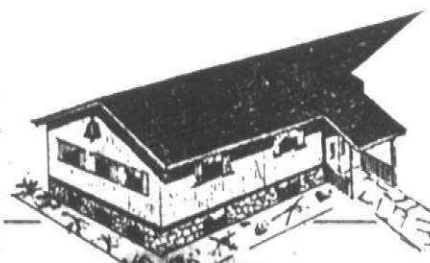

Good news day

Along with all of the crime statistics in the newspapers, the other day came the pleasant news that Tiger Stadium, long a landmark at the corner of Michigan and Trumbull Avenue, was going to be given a face lift and brought up to modern standards.

No better news could have been given to the old timers who have been journeying out there year after year, to cheer for their heroes. It was positive proof that the old ball park would not be abandoned and the team sent on its way to join the other pro battalions in Pontiac.

It was pleasant for more reasons than that, too. The fact that it was to be modernized brought back memories of the many changes they have seen over the century.

There are few persons around today who remember when it opened as Bennett Park, in memory of Charley Bennett, one of the early heroes of the baseball fans.

If there are old timers around who still remember the park in those days, they'll tell you that home plate was in the corner that is now right field. Seems odd when you sit in the stadium today and try to imagine the batters facing the west. But that is how it started.

WITH THE PASSING of Charlie Bennett, the club was taken over by Frank J. Navin, one of the shrewdest baseball owners of all time. The stadium became known as Navin Field.

That name stuck for years. But along about the 1930's, when Navin came upon hard times, Walter O. Briggs, the multi-millionaire who made his fortune in automobile bodies, took over.

Mr. Briggs became financially interested in the club in a large way when he put up the \$125,000 cash to purchase Mickey Cochrane from Connie Mack and had him manage the team.

It was Briggs who ordered the park enlarged in 1934 when the Tigers won the pennant. He convinced the Detroit City Council to close Cherry Street to allow for the erection of an open air steel bleacher section. Up to that time the only bleacher section was in right field where the wooden structure accommodated 1,000 fans and often was referred to Harry Heilmann's fan club. Harry was the star right fielder, and a hero even in the days of Ty Cobb.

With Briggs' hand firmly on the club, he took over operations in their entirety when Frank Navin died immediately after the Tigers won the World Series in 1935.

Once in sole possession of the organization, Briggs moved fast. He had the stadium re-named Briggs Stadium and had the upper decks built in both right and left fields.

The stadium was meant to be a monument to the Briggs family. But after Mr. Briggs' death, a move was

started to rename the old ball park.

When the group, of which John Fetzner, the present owner, was a member, purchased the franchise, they decided to call the place Tiger Stadium.

Even when Fetzner gained complete control, he refused to change the name. He refused to have it designated as a monument to him.

And now the old place is undergoing another change. This time it will be the property of the City of Detroit. But it will be dressed up with escalators, special booths built in front of the second deck and be equipped with all of the modern conveniences.

But to The Stroller it will always be Navin Field. That is the ball park he came to away back in 1924 when he had to climb a catwalk to reach the press box.

It was from this difficult to reach perch that he watched Ty Cobb and the other Tiger heroes through the 54 years he has been a denizen of the press coop.

That day in 1924 when he made his debut as a major league baseball writer will live with him always. And even when he peeks out of the more modern perch when the new season rolls around, he will still see Ty Cobb carrying three bats on his way to the plate and Mickey Cochrane (Black Mike) leading the Tigers to the World Championship. To him it still be Navin Field.

Our neglected children—Part IV

The City of Plymouth collected a lot of valuable information about the segment of its population 65 and older when it conducted a survey of senior citizens living in the city.

A lot of useful information was obtained on needs in the area of housing, transportation, health care, nutrition, shopping, and expendable income.

The survey suggests the value of a community-wide audit, to survey the needs and problems of all age groups to find out what is happening to the community's children, teens, the old, the sick, the unemployed, the family struggling to get ahead.

The idea of a community-wide audit of human resources is suggested by Urie Bronfenbrenner who believes the survey also should include information about the performance of the caretakers of our youth—social workers, doctors, teachers, and non-professionals.

"My bet is you'd discover a lot of problems in most communities—overburdened parents, understaffed programs, houses where nobody can be found at home when the kids get there," he writes. "Perhaps then you could ask local employers to arrange working schedules so somebody could be home, and organize the people who are interested in caring for kids or helping a parent, but haven't been asked. I think this sort of thing may work when other community projects fail, because people do care about children."

One thing we might discover is that although we have created caretaking positions we haven't done well in providing the resources needed for them to function effectively. An audit should not only identify caretaking functions, but should measure whether such functions are being performed as expected.

ONE CONCLUSION which might be drawn after such an audit is com-

pleted, is that business, industry and government as employers need to increase the number and status of part-time positions, including home-based part-time job opportunities.

We also might then be able to put together schedules to have children's groups visiting business and industry—not for vocational education reasons, but to acquaint youngsters with adults as participants in the world of work.

We also might learn how effectively our neighborhoods have been planned. On planning, Bronfenbrenner notes: "Children gauge their freedom not by the extent of open areas around them, but by the liberty they have to be among people and things that excite them and fire their imaginations."

"Children in the older cities seem enthusiastic about their surroundings. Among the specific factors to be considered are the location of shop, and businesses where children can have contact with adults at work, recreational and day care facilities readily accessible to parents as well as children, provision for family recreation, availability of public transportation, and perhaps, most important of all, places to walk, sit, and talk in common company."

PLANNING OF COMMUNITIES and neighborhoods must carefully take into account how our children will grow up because of major changes in our society since World War II.

"Over the years," writes Bronfenbrenner, "de facto responsibility for upbringing has shifted away from the family to their settings in the society, some of which don't recognize or accept the task."

"In the past it wasn't just your relatives but everybody in the neighborhood who minded your business. People cared. Children in a small town become well acquainted with a substantial greater number of adults

in different walks of life, and are more likely to be active participants in the adult setting which they enter."

Urbanization, however, has reduced the extended family to the immediate family and has shrunk the neighborhood to small circle of friends—most of them accessible only by car or telephone.

"Increasingly, today's housing projects have no stores, no shops, no services, no adults at work or play. Neighborhood experiences available to children are extremely limited."

Although Soviet parents may spend less time at home, more of that time appears to be spent in conservation, play, and companionship with children than in American families."

Bronfenbrenner also suggests that in neighborhoods activities are needed in which persons engage as aides, volunteers, etc., to work with children. Such activity by adults for children could involve supervising and playing games, exhibiting or teaching a hobby or skill, exposing the child to a successful adult in his neighborhood. Or, better yet, "a neighborhood center, represented to the community not merely as a place where children go but rather where all members of the community go in joint interest of themselves and their children."

And, finally, another thing which a community-wide audit might lead to is an establishment of a Commission on Children—similar to commissions on aging. Commissions on aging have performed valuable services in other communities, but society also needs to protect its front flank—children who must grow up in a rapidly changing society to become the leaders of tomorrow.

If the new generation of leaders fail it will be, in part, because we have failed. If we neglect our children today, the pay-off will come tomorrow. That's why we must look to the front flank—there's a heavy price to pay for neglect.

U-M hospital to let dads participate in Cesarean

University of Michigan Hospital has announced a policy change which will allow husbands and fathers to participate in nearly all birth procedures at its Women's Hospital unit—including operations for Cesarean sections.

The U-M hospital is the first in Michigan and believed to be the second (the other institution is Boston City Hospital, Boston, Mass.) in the nation to routinely open its operating-delivery rooms to fathers—making Cesarean sections a family event as well as an operation.

According to Dr. George H. Nolan, U-M associate professor of obstetrics and gynecology, the policy was changed at the request of parents who missed the closeness of natural birth at which the husband, in recent years, has almost always been present.

"The mothers very much wanted their husband by their side while facing this procedure (Cesarean section)," Dr. Nolan said. This was particularly true for women who had come to expect their husband's presence during natural childbirth classes and was medically feasible with the use of a regional (spinal) anesthetic.

U-M physicians have found that the husband could be present in the operating room if complications made a natural, vaginal delivery impossible, the obstetrician said. The new U-M policy represents a reverse attitude shift for most medical staff members who became convinced of its value when fathers were allowed to witness Cesarean sections on a test basis.

A STUDY under way since last November at the U-M has shown that of 66 Cesarean births with the husband present, there has been no adverse effect on mother, child or father.

"None fainted," Dr. Nolan said of the husbands, "and, to a man, they strongly supported the concept and said that they would want to be present if their mates were to have more children."

U-M physicians also found that, if both the parents are present in the operating room, they gained a greater appreciation for the efforts of the doctors and other members of the health care team than if the husband is left to sweat it out alone in the waiting room.

"They believed their wives got good care, but seeing it first hand makes a world of difference," Dr. Nolan said.

Little is changed in the Cesarean procedure when the husband is present, except that one nurse is assigned to look after him and explain procedures. The rest of the operating room team—two obstetricians, two pediatricians, two anesthesiologists, and three nurses—concentrate solely on the mother and child.

THE FATHER sits close to his wife's head and both are screened off from the operating field while the incision is made. The screen is lowered later and both have the opportunity to see the child come forth in a manner similar to natural birth, Dr. Nolan explained.

Within an hour, suturing is complete and the mother is in the delivery suite recovery room, holding her child with her husband still at her side.

The use of Cesarean births in the U.S. has doubled in recent years because, with modern antibiotics, anesthetics, blood banking and improved surgical techniques, it is preferable to a difficult natural delivery, Dr. Nolan said.

NOW announces support of Jeffries

The Michigan Conference of the National Organization for Women (NOW) has put itself squarely behind Ruth Jeffries, past president of the Oakland County NOW chapter, who is being sued by Dr. Don R. Krohn.

Dr. Krohn, chief of obstetrics and gynecology at Providence Hospital in Southfield, was acquitted in June of second-degree sexual assault charges.

A West Bloomfield housewife had accused Dr. Krohn of breaking into her home and repeatedly striking and fondling her.

But Oakland County Circuit Judge William Beer found Dr. Krohn innocent of the sex charge, saying Dr. Krohn lacked criminal intent because he was intoxicated.

Dr. Krohn filed suit against Ms. Jeffries after she and the Oakland County NOW chapter sought his removal from the hospital post.

The suit charges libel as well as violation of Dr. Krohn's contractual rights.

Support for Ms. Jeffries was announced at a press conference last week by Nan Frost-Welmers, NOW state coordinator.

"We strongly support the action taken by Ms. Jeffries and the Oakland County chapter of NOW," said Ms. Frost-Welmers. "We cannot continue to allow men who have been abusive to women to remain in positions of power over us."

Ms. Jeffries, acting on behalf of her NOW chapter, requested the physician's removal from his position at Providence because, she said, his actions "clearly violate moral and ethical standards . . . and raise deep concerns . . . because of the position of authority and trust which he holds."

Dr. Krohn must still face trial on drunk driving charges, and for failure to stop for a police officer.

The Michigan Conference of NOW also supports Oakland County NOW in its attempt to have Dr. Krohn removed as chief of obstetrics and gynecology at the Hospital.

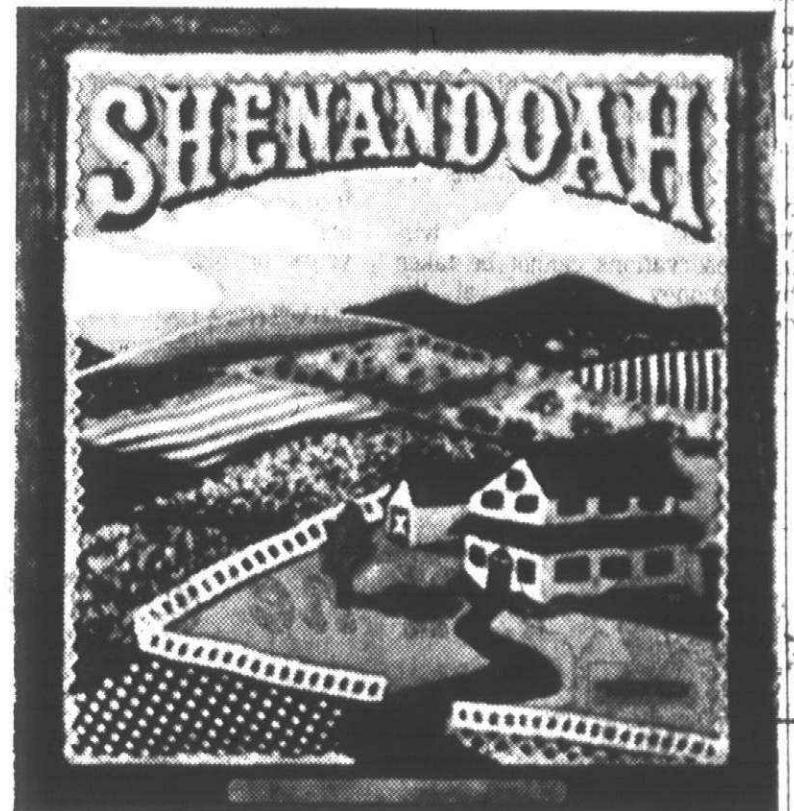

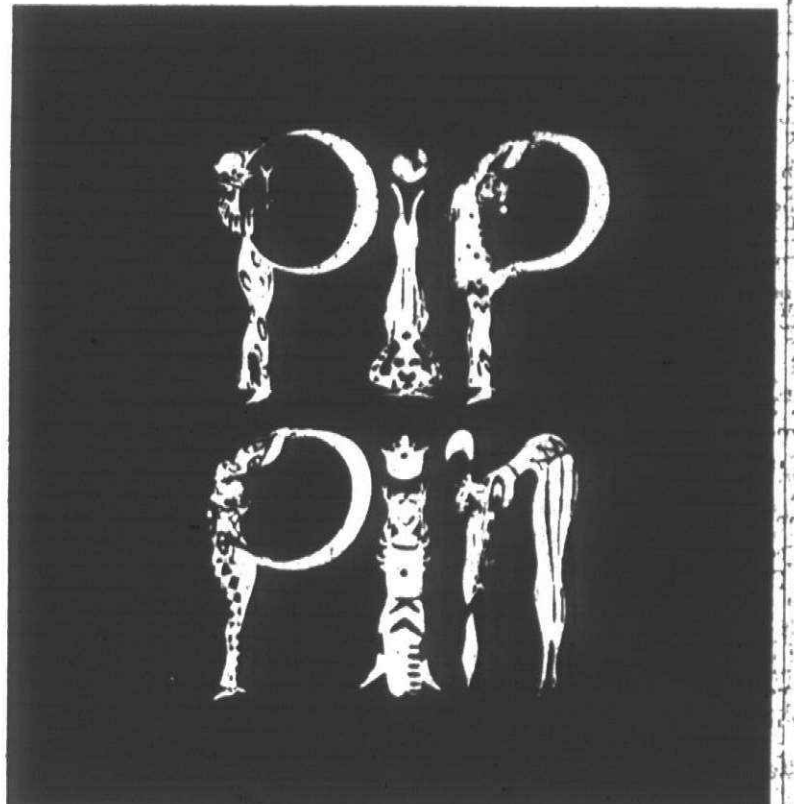

Garage sales feature at EMU

Every weekday afternoon, Eastern Michigan University puts an array of its surplus equipment and supplies on sale, turning its cavernous surplus warehouse into a giant garage sale.

Everything from televisions to hide-a-beds to old gym lockers can be purchased between the hours of 1-4 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

"We've got all kinds of good stuff that's very reasonable," says John Langer, property control manager. "It's reasonable because the initial purchase price is low and if the buyers have to have items repaired, they can afford to."

Hide-a-beds, he says, are a bargain at \$15. "Sure, they're in deplorable condition," he says, "but for that price, you can afford to recover them."

Other items may be in perfect working condition, but may be obsolete for use in a university office or department. Such items find their way to the surplus warehouse, where a price tag is attached.

"We've got a black-and-white TV for \$25," Langer points out. "It works fine; it just takes a little longer warming up because it's the older variety. And we've got an excellent blueprint machine. We're selling vacuum sweepers from the dorms for a dollar each."

AN EMU EMPLOYEE for 10 years, Langer is the man who determines the prices of surplus items. Prices of some items, he says, are based on the item's trade-in allowance, as is the case with typewriters and adding machines. Other items are priced at about 10 per cent of their acquisition cost.

Whatever an item is sold for, Langer notes that the department from whence it came gets credit from the sale, minus about 10 to 15 per cent "commission" for the surplus warehouse.

"We can give them (departments and offices) credit toward their account," Langer says, "but we can't give the credit until we get the item here and we sell it. We get rid of the junk that we used to send to the dump. And we get a few dollars for each item."

Langer gets as much as \$250 for a reconditioned IBM electric typewriter and as little as a dime for burned out fluorescent tubes. Stoves go for as little as \$3 and as much as \$15. A good refrigerator from a family student apartment runs about \$25.

THE EMU property control manager says he's in the business of providing needed items for the public, faculty, staff and especially students, who might not have the capital to make a sizable investment in a "major purchase" item. But another facet of his job is to entice potential buyers into using their imagination for items which may be overlooked.

"We had one professor who came in here and bought an old 72-slot mail box from one of the dorms," he says. "He took the glass out of each cubby-hole and now uses it for a wine rack. He stores 120 bottles of wine in his basement now."

Another member of Eastern's staff bought some old lockers, painted them and placed them in a prominent location in his family room. They're now used as an attractive storage facility.

Langer says he's also sold narrow closet doors which have been used as shelving. He even has a good supply of yard-long spaghetti stirrers, once used by dining commons chefs, now suitable for use as kitchen decorations. But Langer says he's got much more to do than price surplus items and take cash.

"I'm busy every day looking for items for departments," he says. "I spend every morning going from department to department looking for items they might need. And, I expedite the moving of equipment out of the buildings where they're no longer needed."

So, if you're in the market for an old telephone, some antique light fixtures, barber-style classroom seats, used copy machines, a bulletin board, a youth's wheel chair, an old oak desk—or much, much more, see Langer, Eastern's "garage sale man." The surplus warehouse is located adjacent to Central Stores at 1215 Huron River Drive near Cornell Street. For more information, phone 487-4197.

Handicapped get own State Fair categories

Handicapped persons who do needlework or home crafts now will have a special category to compete in at the Michigan State Fair.

Two new categories, needlework by a handicapped person and crafts by a handicapped person, are the newest classes to be added to the community arts exhibition categories, according to Marie Harding, supervisor of community arts.

They were added because of a num-

ber of requests, she said.

Exhibits in the community arts department of the fair are in four divisions—needlework and handicraft, canning and preserving, baking, and flower arranging. The hundreds of individual classes include such diverse items as doll houses, needlepoint pictures, Irish soda bread and South African cake decorating.

Rules for entering any of the categories and application forms are print-

ed in the community arts premium list, which is available now to persons interested in exhibiting, according to Mrs. Harding. Any Michigan resident may enter.

Entry deadline for community arts exhibits, as well as those in all other Michigan State Fair divisions, such as the agriculture and youth divisions, is Aug. 1. The only exception is the horse show which has an entry deadline of July 25.

The community arts department, in addition to its four regular divisions, will continue the popular Make It and Take It Workshops and the fine arts exhibition.

The department will continue to offer For Men Only classes in needlework, baking, canning and preserving. The 11-day fair will run from Aug. 26 through Sept. 5, Labor Day, at the Michigan State Fairgrounds, Eight Mile Road and Woodward in Detroit.

In past Canton all-star games, defending champion McMurray competed against a team of stars from the "A" Division.

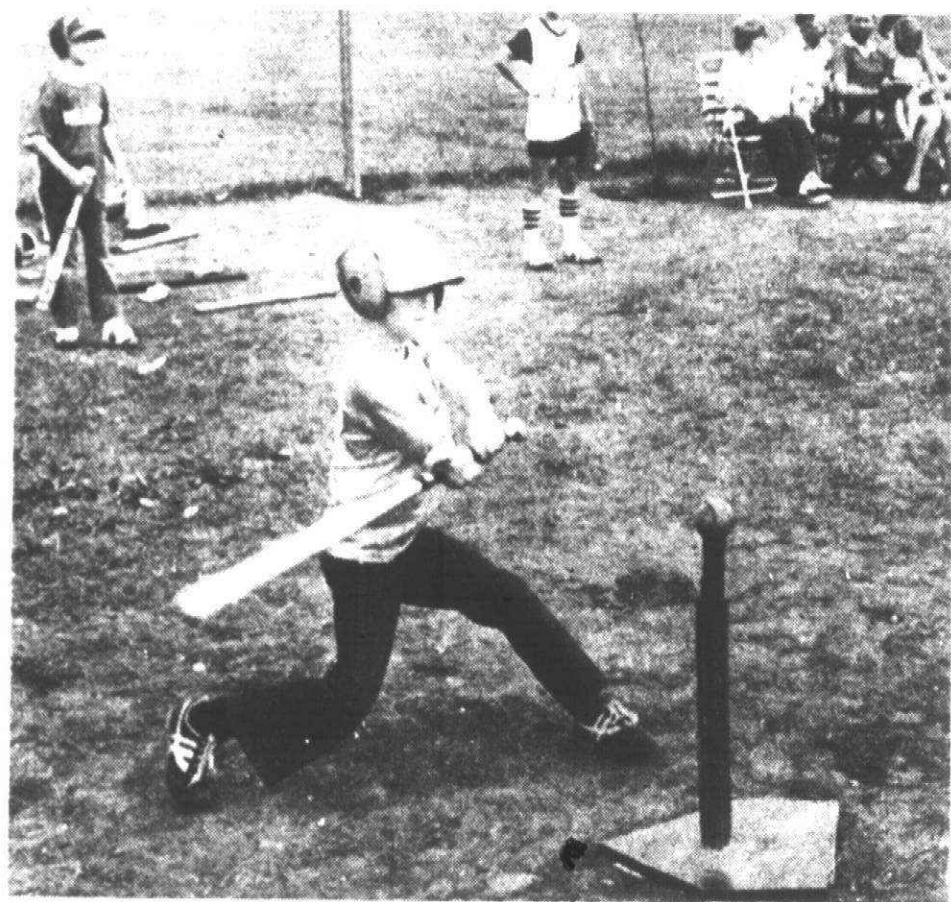
Last year, the league expanded to two divisions and selected all-stars competed against each other representing the respective divisions.

Thoroughbred season opens

Freeway to aid DRC patrons

By DENNIS O'CONNOR

The realization this fall of long-awaited dream of freeway access to the Detroit Race Course is only one reason racing officials are hoping for one of the best thoroughbred racing seasons in the 28-year history of the Livonia-based track.

The thoroughbred season officially opened Tuesday at the corner of Middle Belt and Schoolcraft Roads

and will last for 119 days through December 3.

It is no secret that last year's attendance was one of the most disappointing in DRC history, but a brighter future is anticipated beginning in the next couple of months.

Besides the September opening of the Jeffries Freeway east of Telegraph, racing fans from all over the state can look forward to better horses, higher stakes and numerous

special events.

"The opening of the freeway is going to make a big difference," said Earl Flora, director of publicity at DRC. "There is no question about it."

"We didn't run a survey during the past harness season on the effects of the new I-275 freeway, but we know we attracted many people from Monroe County and northern Ohio."

"Hazel Park just completed a successful thoroughbred season, and once we get the whole road network, we think we will open up to all thoroughbred fans from that area."

Ever since DRC opened in 1950, it's been a dream to get highway access from downtown Detroit and Canada.

"It's like a bad nightmare ending and a dream come true," said Racing Analyst Kenn Christopher. "The freeway construction gave us some problems in 1972."

RACING FANS know the value of good horses, and DRC officials boast some of the best around.

"We have 85 to 90 per cent of Hazel

Park's thoroughbreds coming here plus horses from Churchill Downs in Kentucky, Arlington Park in Chicago and Aksarben in Omaha, Neb.," Flora said.

A rich stakes program of \$700,000 will also be offered for special races.

There will be 23 stakes which include a purse of \$15,000 or more.

The biggest of all these special events is the annual Michigan Mile which takes place on Sept. 3.

While the stakes will be \$100,000-added, Flora said that hopes of luring Seattle Slew, famous teenage jockey Steve Cauthen, or both, to the Mile is a possibility.

"It's all in the working stages now," Flora said. "But it isn't dreaming. This is in our minds, and it's a distinct possibility of getting Slew or Cauthen for the Mile. Tom Dorsey (director of thoroughbred racing) is looking into the possibility."

Flora also hopes to get permission from the Racing Commission for Sunday racing on the Labor Day weekend to help make the weekend an overwhelming success.

Body shop revives Corvette ragtop

The reports of the death of the Corvette convertible may be greatly exaggerated, thanks to Terry Olexsy and John Denman.

The pair, co-owners of Corvette Custom and Collision in Farmington, plan to disprove General Motors' market analysts in a surprising but obvious way.

"We're taking brand new '77 Corvettes and turning them into convertibles," says Olexsy. "When they roll out of here, they'll be identical to those that rolled out of the St. Louis assembly plant."

GM discontinued the classic ragtop in 1976.

Olexsy believes the shop is unique in the country, although other companies are converting Cadillac Eldorados and Lincolns. He expects to convert 100 Corvettes before the '78 models are out.

"Each car will have a special plaque identifying it as one of 100 cars, which will help the resale and

possibly make it a collector's item," he says.

THAT CANVAS TOP will cost the customer about \$3,500, but Olexsy and Denman don't think the price will deter their customers.

"About 40 per cent of Corvette owners store their cars for the winter," says Olexsy. "And dealers are allocated so many Corvettes per year."

"They could probably sell twice as many as they make, but they keep the volume down and the price up. People who buy Corvettes simply want them at any price."

A '77 Corvette with a moderate number of accessories is priced at about \$10,300, with an expected appreciation of about \$1,000 a year. Denman contends, however, the newer models can't compare in performance to models made 10 years ago.

"The Corvette buyer today is usually in a professional line of work, as opposed to racing enthusiasts who bought the car in the 1960s. GM compromised the car to go along with the

new Corvette buyer, plus the federal regulations and pollution standards affect the performance and handling," he claims.

The risk of theft apparently doesn't dismay the Corvette buyer either.

"Someone once rated the street life of a Corvette in New York City at about three minutes," Olexsy quips. "But all higher priced cars are in the same category."

STANDARD EQUIPMENT on Corvettes includes burglar alarms, and Denman advises convertible owners to leave the doors unlocked and the alarm activated as the best bet to avoid theft.

"Nothing stops a professional, but you can keep the rookies and kids away," he says.

Despite their faith in the ragtop, Olexsy and Denman aren't putting their entire investment on the line with the convertible.

"We're offering full service facilities for Corvettes, including mechanical and body work," Olexsy explains.

"And we're doing general collision on all lines of cars."

The partners' expertise is what got them into the business, and they're hoping the same expertise will bring them more customers. They started their shop at 32411 Grand River three years ago after spending seven years learning Corvette repair at a dealership in Southfield. Until recently, they only occupied the back of the building.

"It's like a dream come true for a lot of people to own this kind of operation," says Olexsy, including himself in that category. "We were tired of working for someone else and making money for someone else," says Denman. Because they both own and love Corvettes, the business came naturally.

Although buying into such a business usually requires about \$50,000, Olexsy says, the partners lucked into a "sweetheart deal," as Denman calls it.

"We took over the back portion of the shop and bought the equipment—the price was right because we just had to take over the payments."

"We went into it at a bad time, economically, but the specialty of this kind of business worked."

ALTHOUGH THEIR shop is in Farmington, their market area stretches as far away as Ohio and Traverse City.

The building itself has housed numerous types of automotive businesses. "We even found an old Studebaker sign in the rafters," Olexsy adds.

Keeping six employees busy doesn't seem to be a problem, and the partners can get parts from GM and a fiberglass parts manufacturer in Rochester.

Matching paint appears to be the biggest hassle for the young entrepreneurs, although Denman believes they've developed a good mixing system.

"Solid colors are easier to match than metallics, since there are four or five grades of metallic or powdered aluminum. It's like different grades of sugar, from coarse to fine, but we have all the tints and grades so we can match things here."

One car was painted four times before the job was declared done, Denman says. Corvette owners, like many car buffs, want specialized service.

"Because we've worked with these cars for a long time, we know why and where they squeak and leak," Olexsy says.

Future plans include branching out into other specialty areas. The partners plan to include a hardtop option for the convertible makeovers. It will be a fiberglass top that will bolt on the car for the winter and will cost the convertible customer an extra \$500.

They're also attempting to get a special contract with General Motors to make a limited number of Corvettes with special trim and paint in honor of the car's 25th anniversary next year.

Hiawatha land is a tinderbox

Vacationers should be extremely careful about using fire or potential sources of fire when they go into northern Michigan. If the current dry spell continues, forestlands could become a tinderbox.

"The dominant, single harbinger of past disastrous fires in the eastern U.S. was drought. Precipitation deficits over an extensive area for three to eight months preceded nearly all historically prominent fires," says Von J. Johnson, USDA Forest Service fire research specialist and instructor at Michigan State University.

His description fits most of northern lower Michigan and the U.P. Much of Michigan's forest and croplands did not receive adequate rain last fall to replenish moisture lost during the late summer months. Winter wasn't much better. The snow that fell, deeply in some places, contained little moisture. Conditions this spring have been worse.

"Since January, we have received about half the precipitation we normally obtain and rainfall for May is down 60 per cent from normal," Johnson says.

All this sets the stage for potentially more serious fire conditions than currently exist. Unless the forestlands receive considerable rainfall amounts between now and August, leaves will dry and fall prematurely, and grasslands will dry, adding to the already existing combustible material.

Johnson says that historical patterns show that there is a better than

50 per cent chance that current dry conditions will persist through summer. If that does occur, it will mean Michigan forestlands are in a position for serious fires not experienced in the past 20 to 50 years.

Under such conditions, extreme caution must be exercised. Special precautions must be taken with campfires, portable cooking units, catalytic converters on cars, smoking, etc.

Vacationers enjoying the woodlands are advised to stay on well-worn footpaths or trails within approved campgrounds, or on roadways. On windy afternoons, stay out of areas where there is dried brush, undergrowth, and moss. "I'd avoid such areas like poison ivy," Johnson comments.

If a small, smoking fire is spotted, put it out immediately, but if it can't be done easily, get out of the area and be sure to report it to the nearest fire control agency or police department.

Persons vacationing in woodland resort areas and campgrounds should ask the facility manager about the fire warning system and evacuation.

"I don't want to scare people out of vacationing in the north, but if our dry conditions persist, I want them to be mindful of the potential hazard that may exist," Johnson says.

He says that each year Michigan normally expects about 1,100 fires to burn 5,300 acres. By Sept. 30, 1976, almost 1,200 fires had burned 23,853 acres, which exceeded 0.1 per cent of the protected area for the first time in almost 20 years.

Drought can hurt gardens

What's the difference between a successful vegetable garden and a disappointing one? This year, it's likely to be water.

Dry hot weather is rough on vegetable crops, points out Bob Herner, extension horticulturist at Michigan State University. Three stages of crop growth are especially critical.

"The first crucial time occurs when the seeds are germinating," Herner says. "Severe drought just as the roots are forming or the first leaves are pushing up through the soil can kill the young plants."

The second critical stage is during flowering and fruit set in crops like beans, tomatoes and peppers. Drought at this time will cause flowers and fruits to drop off.

Insufficient water when fruits are forming will cause deformed or undersized fruits, Herner says. Beans, cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers, eggplant and other such crops are particularly susceptible.

Though no vegetable crops withstand drought well, some are more sensitive than others. Shallow-rooted crops like squash, cucumbers, melons and pumpkins need more frequent watering than deeper-rooted crops like tomatoes. Tomatoes can reach down into the soil for moisture; the shallow-rooted plants must rely on water nearer the surface.

Corn will also tolerate some drought, Herner points out, except when the kernels are forming. The ears will not fill out if the corn is dry at that time.

"Even during the critical times for vegetable crops, watering once a week is enough if it's done properly," Herner advises. "Water with a fine spray for a couple of hours to get the soil wet down deep, and then don't water again for a week or so. Mulching after the soil is thoroughly wet is a good idea, too. Covering the soil surface with black plastic or several inches of straw prevents the loss of moisture from the soil."
