## Hendry Nursing Home evicting 40 elderly tenants on Medicaid

The Hendry Convalescent Center in Plymouth, considered the Cadillac of state nursing homes, is evicting 40 elderly patients this winter because it can no longer afford to keep them.

Close relatives of 10 of the patients have received letters from John C. Hendry, executive director, notifying them to make transfer arrangements by Jan. 30. Notices to the 30 remaining patients are forthcoming.

"Believe me, we don't feel happy about this," Hendry said. "This isn't the kind of thing anyone relishes around here. But we really have no choice in the matter."

All of the 40 senior citizens are on Medicaid and will be replaced by private patients.

Hendry receives \$24.55 per day per person through the Medicaid program, but claims the daily cost to him is \$32. The \$24.55 figure is the maximum amount a nursing home can be paid by Medicaid as determined by the state legislature.

"IN ECONOMIC terms, this move should have been made 1 1/2 years ago. That's when we stopped accepting Medicaid patients. It was a tough decision to make. We'd keep these people if we were breaking even, but we're not coming close."

There's no way you can give the kind of care offered here with the money the state pays. For all the trained nurses and professional care in this building, the state pays less than \$1 per hour," Hendry said.

The Hendry Convalescent Center is considered one of the best nursing homes in the state. The three-floor facility includes lounges with antique furniture, physical therapy rooms, and post administrative offices.

State auditors have criticized the nursing home for providing "too much recreational space per person," according to Hendry. "The state says it only wants a standard nursing home."

The cost of running the local convalescent center is such that Medicaid payments do not come close to meeting Hendry's cost, forcing him to evict those patients on state aid.

"We absolutely will not compromise our high standards. The day we do that, the 'For Sale' sign goes up," Hendry said.

HENDRY IS staunch in his belief that elderly patients deserve the very best in medical care. And if the state does not wish to pay for such care, Hendry says there is nothing he can do about it.

"What it comes down to is that you get what you pay for," says Charles F. Herbert, an administrator at the convalescent center.

One worker at the Dept. of Social Services said the state's special treatment toward Wayne County's Walter Reuther nursing facility in Westland triggered other convalescent homes to refuse Medicaid patients.

The Reuther center receives \$55 a day for each patient from the state, about half of the county's actual cost, after reports that transferring 200 aged and long-term patients could harm their health.

"I wish the heck the state would pay me \$55 a day. I can match anything they have at Reuther. They say Reuther has sicker patients. Baloney!" Hendry said.

The recent hike in the federal minimum wage level from \$2.30 to \$2.65 per hour also has put a damper on nursing home finances. Some of Hen-

ry's 110 employees are paid at the minimum scale. The 35 cents-an-hour increase has not influenced Medicaid payments to date.

A RECOMMENDATION has been sent to the state legislature to approve an increase in Medicaid payments corresponding with the minimum wage hike. Sources say the Medicaid increase will only amount to 50 cents a day.

"We haven't heard one damn word from Lansing and they've known about the minimum wage thing since last June," Hendry said. State legislators will likely study the matter when the new session begins later this week, according to a spokesman for the Dept. of Social Services.

There are some deep concerns among relatives of the evicted patients concerning the traumatic effect moving will have on the elderly persons.

Dr. Donald Davis, of Plymouth, says the move will be tough on his mother,

Donna Davies, 83. "She's been at Hendry's for five years and she can't walk because of a broken hip she sustained there. It'll be hard on her."

"It's distressing for an 80- or 90-year-old person to be taken away from a familiar setting, particularly if they have some good friends there. Many elderly people die after they are moved. They refuse to eat," said one clerk at the Dept. of Social Services.

HENDRY IS helping patients relocate by directing them to Anne Olmslead of the Dept. of Social Services. She is providing patients with a list of nursing homes with empty beds.

"I'm sure they'll find another place to stay, but there won't be any as nice as Hendry's. You can bet they won't find any grand pianos or antique furniture in their new homes," Mrs. Olmslead said.

Other nursing homes in the area operate on considerably lower budgets, and they too, feel the pinch created by low Medicaid payments.

"I think every home should maintain some beds for welfare patients," said Carl Lampton of West Trail Nursing Home in Plymouth. "But it's tough to do under the Medicaid program. I can see where Hendry's coming from."

"I imagine Mr. Hendry has a lot of overhead, but I would never kick out a Medicaid patient. Sure, you can make more on a private patient, but I would never do that. People on Medicaid are human like everyone else," said Connie Nowka of Whispering Willow Manor in Canton.

Hendry said if the Medicaid patients make legitimate attempts to move, he won't throw them out.

"It will be a long transition process before all 40 are moved. We're not going to kick anyone out in the cold," he said.

## Widow loses \$12,613 in con

Wayne County Sheriff's detectives reluctantly released a woman in her mid-30's Friday who they believe conned a 77-year-old Canton Township widow out of \$12,603 in an elaborate pigeon drop scheme. The money has not yet been recovered.

Police say the widow—which began at the Westland Mall—nearly squeezed another \$40,000 out of the elderly woman but banks balked at issuing her that much cash and the three con artists involved wouldn't accept a certified check for the amount.

One suspect taken into custody for questioning by police Thursday was released Friday afternoon when her attorney argued successfully in circuit court that police had no right to hold her more than 24 hours without a warrant for her arrest. A warrant for the arrest is expected to be released by the prosecutor's office today.

Police were tipped off to the swindle by employees of the Merchant Detective Agency of Lincoln Park. The suspect and the widow who was conned hired a security guard to escort them while they transported the large amount of cash. This was done at the suggestion of the suspect as a ploy to gain the woman's confidence, according to police.

But the private detective firm alerted Westland Police because a similar line was used in a Dearborn Heights pigeon drop, according to Det. Ray Allen of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

Last Thursday, after \$12,613 had already been handed over, and police conducted their surveillance, the suspect was taken in for questioning by deputies.

BUT, ON FRIDAY, the Detroit mayor candidate, was successful in getting his client released from the sheriff's custody because deputies had not obtained a warrant for her arrest from the prosecutor's office within 24 hours of being taken in for questioning.

She was released on her own recognizance by Wayne County Circuit Judge Myron Wahls, and if the warrant is issued today, she faces arraignment at 2 p.m. in Westland's 18th District Court. "I can't understand why she was released," Det. Allen said.

"She gave us no reliable address, no reliable name, she had no proper identification on her when we picked her up and there have been phone threats

made to the victim. There's over \$12,000 missing and yet the judge releases her under her own recognizance."

Det. Allen said the pigeon drop victim told police she met the suspect who was carrying a parcel inside the Westland Mall. The con artist reportedly asked her if she knew where a particular messenger service was located.

The widow found out there was no such messenger service. The police suspect reportedly told her that she had found the package at the mall and was trying to find its rightful owner. She explained to her pigeon that since there was no such messenger service she would call her "attorney" to see what should be done with the package.

HER "ATTORNEY," an alleged accomplice to the crime, said over the phone that the rightful owner probably would never be located because the

messenger company didn't exist. So rather than giving it to the police who would only keep the money, it was explained, why not split the money up?

"Since the rightful owner could not be found, they were legally entitled to keep the contents of the package, the phony attorney advised."

As part of the plan, the package was opened to see what was inside. A large stash of "front money" was found inside the package in five bank bags equipped with locks. The widow was led to believe there was \$60,000 in the package.

Another woman soon arrived on the scene, and was introduced as an employee of the attorney who just gave the legal advice. She joined the con artist and their unsuspecting victim. Police described the second woman in on the scheme as a Latino.

## 'Parity' obsolete—MSU economist

With the newly found militancy of the small farmer in the American Agriculture Movement comes the battle cry for "parity."

At the heart of the movement is the small farmer asking for a "fair rate of return."

Many area farmers participating in the last Tuesday's farm price protest used the term but few could pin down just what parity meant or how it could be achieved.

The American Heritage Dictionary defines this often-used and more often misrepresented term as: "A level for farm product prices, maintained by governmental support and intended to give farmers the same purchasing power they had during a chosen base period."

During the 1930s, the base period that was used to establish equal or 100 per cent parity was the "golden age" of American farming—the years 1910 to 1914.

Dr. George Dike, professor of agricultural economics at Michigan State University, calls parity an outdated formula that would be nearly impossible to equitably apply to modern farming. If established, he said parity would create unprecedented surpluses because farmers would grow more crops for more money, thus creating a glut on the world market.

President Jimmy Carter says if American farmers were paid according to a parity formula, their crops could no longer compete in the world market due to an artificially created price.

"IN THE '30s, they tried to look at

individual commodities to establish a parity price," Dr. Dike said. "What does it cost to produce a bushel of wheat, what kind of price do we need to cover it? What are the expenses of producing that wheat? Back then you needed a horse, horseshoes, a buggy whip. But you'd have a heckuva time trying to translate the cost of producing that bushel of wheat today with \$40,000 tractors, commercial fertilizers and land at \$2,000 an acre."

"But the agricultural economists at MSU fed appropriate data into a computer to find a comparable parity price for wheat today," Dr. Dike explained.

"Arithmetic says that today's parity price for the sale of a bushel of wheat should be \$5.02. That's a little unrealistic because there are many farmers who could get rich today if they sold wheat for \$4 or even \$3 a bushel. We'd have so many people raising wheat that even if the Russians bought it all at that price we'd still be in trouble with the surplus."

National spokesmen for American Agriculture say that surpluses can be avoided by putting quotas on acreage and amount of a crop that can be sold.

"They say they don't want federal subsidies or federal controls," Dr. Dike said. "Well, who will police that? I'm all in favor of equity for farmers. You've got to sympathize with the striker who owes all that money on his equipment to the banks. But when you start putting numbers on crop production you've got a problem on your hands. Right now, nobody's come up with a decent solution."

## George Lawton resigns from board of education

George Lawton has resigned—effective today—from the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education, ending a career of 7 1/2 years as a school trustee and continuing the membership turnover on the board.

Counting Lawton, there has been a turnover of five board members during the past three years. The other four are Marcia Borowski, E.J. McClendon, Marda Benson, and Gary Mirto. That leaves Thomas Yack, board president, as the senior trustee with only four years tenure.

LAWTON GAVE as reason for stepping down, in his resignation letter dated Jan. 9, increasing business demands as manager of the Plymouth Community Federal Credit Union.

"The Community Credit Union which I manage has grown 25 per cent in 1976 and 30 per cent in 1977. As a result of this growth demands on my time have increased to a degree that I am not satisfied with the amount of time I can allocate to school district responsibilities.

"For this reason and other personal considerations, I have decided to submit my resignation to the Plymouth-

Canton Board of Education. My very special thanks to the administration, teachers and non-certified staff for their friendship and helpfulness over a long period of years. It has been an interesting role and my hope is that many more of our qualified citizens will involve themselves in this area of our community life."

Lawton, also a sheep farmer in Canton Township, moved to the Plymouth in 1958. He was an organizer and member of the industrial development commission established to find a tenant for the vacant Daisy Building after the air rifle manufacturer left Plymouth.

During the early 1960s Lawton was elected to the Plymouth City Commission and served four years in that position. He moved to Canton in 1967.

Lawton was elected to the school board in June 1970. He served on the Canton Planning Commission from 1971-73 was chairman in 1971-72.

On the school board, he served as president, secretary and treasurer. "Every position except vice-president," he comments, "although the position I enjoyed most was as just plain member."

When Lawton came on the school board in 1970, the other trustees were Bob Gilmour, Ned Sturton, Esther Hul-

ling, Bruce Scott and John Hanchett. He served with two superintendents, James Rossman and John M. Hoben. "Actually, it was former superintendent Russ Isbister who first really got me interested in schools and was instrumental in my decision to run in 1970," recalls Lawton.

Supt. Hoben expresses regret on Lawton's resignation. "His contribution has been exemplary over the 7 1/2 years he has served on the board."

## S'craft cancels millage election

Schoolcraft College trustees have cancelled plans to use a Feb. 27 special election to ask voters for a one-mill property tax increase.

The 6-2 decision came after two hours of discussion Wednesday and was based on two reasons:

•Livonia School District's decision to "piggyback" its own millage request on the date Schoolcraft had reserved would almost certainly doom the community college's request. Livonia, which has about half the college district's tax base and voters, will seek some 16 mills in renewal and new millage.

•The college itself had yet to put together a campaign plan to change voters' minds after the 1976 and '77 millage losses.

The eight-member college will board will hold a study session to begin wrestling with a new election date. The open meeting will begin at 8 p.m. Wednesday (Jan. 11) in the college's Garden City center at 6701 Harrison.

TRUSTEES Nancie Blatt and Dr. Gerald Cox held out for the Feb. 27 special election.

But after a 4-4 vote on rescinding, Chairman Paul Kadish and Treasurer Harry Greenleaf switched to join trustees Ron Cowden, Mark McQuesten, Rosina Raymond and Leonard Wozniak on cancellation.

Although the big factor was certainly the Livonia school board's decision to use the same date, Schoolcraft trustees pointedly avoided criticizing the Livonia board. Schoolcraft had been first to reserve that date with the Wayne County election scheduling committee.

"With that much on the ballot," said Mrs. Raymond, referring to Livonia's double-pronged, big money request, "people are going to vote against something—and that's us."

She referred to past election results which invariably showed Schoolcraft's money requests getting lower percent-

age "yes" votes than the requests of the K-12 districts—Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville and Plymouth-Canton.

"NO ONE FROM the faculty union is even here," observed Cowden, voicing trustees' concern that the Faculty Forum, bargaining agent for some 160 instructors, had shown little enthusiasm for taking part in a millage campaign from which its members would be the chief beneficiaries.

"We don't have the horses," Cowden added. "I'm not comfortable we could sell it."

McQuesten said, "I have not seen or heard where we have the organization to win (voter) support. Where is this group? I'm not convinced we have the support of the faculty, of the staff or of the community."

"I don't see any other date where anything will be different," answered Mrs. Blatt. "A lot of things are in our favor (on Feb. 27). If we don't, \$450,000 will have to be cut from the budget. That's not just test tubes and paintings. That's people."

KADISH REVEALED he had set up a six-member steering committee to start preliminary campaign planning. This revelation led Dr. Cox to needle him that it should have been done "in the open" by all elected trustees.

Just when another election date might be set is wildly uncertain.

The City of Livonia is eyeing April 11 for a Detroit Edison Co. franchise renewal and some charter amendments. Because some member K-12 districts in the Schoolcraft College District vote in school rather than municipal precincts, April 11 is thus impossible for a college election.

May 11 is seen as a possibility, but it's too close to the regular June school elections.

August was ruled out because partisan primaries will be held then using municipal precincts.

This leaves September as another possibility.



# McMurray on planning body

The second vice-president of the Canton Chamber of Commerce was appointed to the township planning commission Tuesday over the objections of two Canton board members who said the appointment gives the chamber too much influence on the planning board.

Supervisor Harold Stein recommended the chamber official, Frank McMurray, 38, for a three-year term. He joins chamber members Bart Berg, a nursery owner and veterinarian Richard Kirchgatter on the seven-member planning commission.

McMurray, as an officer of the chamber, strenuously lobbied for a relaxed sign and term ordinance, a community landscaping document that the planning commission is now revising.

He replaces Robert Miller, an appointee of former Supervisor Robert Greenstein, who was embroiled in the controversy over the composition of the township's Zoning Board of Appeals. Miller's planning commission term expired Dec. 31.

Township board members approved McMurray's appointment by a 4-2 vote

with Trustee Robert Myers absent. Trustees Brian Schwall and Lynne Goldsmith voted against the appointment because of McMurray's active role in the chamber.

"I THINK FRANK (McMurray) works hard, and he does well at everything he does," said Schwall. "I'm sure he'd do a good job on the planning commission too. I just feel that the chamber of commerce would control the planning commission if he is appointed."

"I'm not questioning Frank's integrity," Schwall said, "but I don't feel a balance will be attained on the planning commission if he is appointed."

But other board members felt McMurray's record as an active volunteer in Canton's government more than qualified him for the job.

"I don't think it's fair to disqualify a person just because of membership in an organization," objected Treasurer Anne Bradley. "I'm a member of the chamber, and it hasn't influenced me."

McMurray, owner of an insurance agency on Canton Center Road, said his chamber membership would not influence his vote on the planning commission.

"It's like saying Brian Schwall is an educator, so his votes on the township board are going to be influenced by the schools," he said.

McMURRAY, A TOWNSHIP resident for the past 15 years, has been active in numerous service organizations and township committees.

He is a member of the Citizens Recreation Advisory Council and served as chairman of that council for six years. He currently serves as the township's dangerous building officer and is secretary of the township building authority.

McMurray is a member of the Canton Jaycees and is working on a charter for a Kiwanis Club chapter in Canton. He is former president of the Young Democrats Club, a member of the Canton Goodfellows and past president of the Holiday Park Homeowners Association.

He is a graduate of Wayne Memorial High School.

McMurray and his wife, Janet, have four children.

## Come with ideas on how to spend U.S. block grant

Ever get the urge to tell the government how to spend your tax money? Well, the moment is near.

Both Plymouth and Canton townships have slated public hearings this week to get citizen suggestions on how to spend federal community development funds.

The hearings will come during the regularly scheduled township board meetings Tuesday night. Any resident of the two communities is free to show up and offer ideas on what the community needs.

Plymouth Township's meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the township hall at the corner of Ann Arbor and Lilley Roads. Canton's will start at 7 p.m. in Fire Hall No. 1 at Canton Center and Cherry Hill Roads.

Mike Gorman, Canton's deputy treasurer, said the township will receive about \$120,000 in federal funds for next year.

"We have discussed a lot of projects we could take on with the block grant," said Gorman. "But nothing really definite. We are hoping the public hearing will be able to give us some direction."

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP Supervisor Thomas Notebaert said he didn't know how much the township would have to work with, but last year's grant was \$123,000.

"We are using about \$99,000 of that for installing new water lines in Green Meadows subdivision," he said. "But that's not enough to complete the work. We are considering using some of the new money to do whatever else is necessary out there."

He also said township officials had discussed using some of the funds to

install separate sanitary and storm sewer facilities in four areas which currently have combination storm and sanitary sewers.

"We aren't really committed to anything yet, and we are looking forward to getting ideas from people at the hearing."

The City of Plymouth held its public hearing last week, and received three citizen ideas, all for improvements in Old Village.

"We are, of course, considering them," said Mark Wollenweber, assistant city administrator. "But we're also in the process of developing some ideas on our own." About \$87,000 of last year's block grant went for improvements to Old Village.

ALTHOUGH RESIDENTS are encouraged to voice their opinions at the public hearings, the projects which are finally decided on will have to meet new and more rigid guidelines for approval.

The new limit set by the Wayne County Office of Program Development, which administers the federal funds for the Plymouth-Canton area, requires that any money approved must benefit low to moderate income persons.

While city and Plymouth Township officials said they didn't anticipate any problem in finding projects to meet the new criteria, Gorman said it could cause Canton some difficulty.

"There just aren't that many low and moderate income people in this area," he said. "If the county sticks to it, we might be hard pressed to find an acceptable project."

## School to add buses, drivers

Plymouth-Canton school trustees are being asked to approve a new transportation plan which would shorten the time elementary pupils are away from home.

The change would allow younger students to arrive at school later in the morning and arrive home earlier in the afternoon than exists under current scheduling.

The trustees are scheduled to vote on the new transportation plan at tonight's (Monday) school board meeting, at 7:30 p.m. in the little theater of Plymouth Canton High School, Canton Center Road, south of Joy.

Other matters coming before the board include: A proposed contract with the Secretarial Association; purchase of sixth grade musical instruments; priorities for expending the balance of the 1974 bond issue funds; and, accepting the resignation of trustee George Lawton.

SUPT. JOHN M. HOBEN will make a presentation early in the meeting on a recommended major change in bus routing.

Bus routing problems have been increasing as the population of the school district has grown, said Hoben. "As the population has increased in

Canton, traffic has increased significantly. We are at the point now where at times, at some schools, students are arriving late from 10 to 45 minutes." Hoben added that transportation routing also is burdened by scheduling for year-round school and transporting parochial school students.

"All of these complexities result in a transportation program which is delivering, in many cases, very poor service to the students and therefore is of great concern on the part of the administration, the board, and the parents."

Hoben said the routing change also represents a shift in the district's bus philosophy. "We have made use of 'double tripping' our bus schedules to use fewer buses. On this behalf we have, without question, used fewer buses than normally would be required if double tripping weren't used."

"Double tripping involves a bus picking up students, taking them to school, and immediately leaving to pick up another group of pupils to transport to school. This means many elementary pupils get to school earlier than normal because the same bus must make another run to pick up high school students before the starting time of school."

The new plan will eliminate double tripping except for four routes at the high school, said Hoben. Students at two elementary schools would start school at 8 a.m., rather than 8:30. Some elementary students might have to begin their school day 15 minutes earlier.

THE DISTRICT NOW uses 53 regular-size buses to cover 191 routes.

The proposal is to use 64 buses. There would then be 64 buses for the high schools, four of which would have double tripping. Sixteen routes would be added to the middle school schedules, and two new routes to elementary buildings.

The district has 10 older buses it had planned to trade in, but hasn't yet sold. The administration is proposing that the buses be repaired and used.

Eleven more bus drivers will have to be hired to meet the busing change. Drivers time, Hoben said, will remain about the same as now because many drivers put in long days.

The recommended change also will help standardize routes and eliminate confusion now existing at schools on the year-round schedule, said school officials.

THE PURCHASE OF SIXTH grade musical instruments and adoption of a

fee schedule for pupils using school instruments has been under board consideration for some time.

Action has been delayed pending an opinion from school attorneys. The attorneys now advise that it would be legal for the district to charge fees for use of instruments, because sixth grade band is a voluntary program.

It would cost \$42,867 for 508 instruments for a sixth grade beginning instrumental program. Jim Griffith, coordinator of music, has recommended that each sixth grade student be charged a \$20 fee for using school instruments.

The board also is scheduled to vote on ratification of a contract with the Secretarial Association, which represents the district's clerical help. Approval by the board is dependent upon ratification by the association.

ANOTHER AGENDA ITEM is to set priorities for spending the balance of funds from the 1974 school construction bond issue.

The 1974 bond fund has a balance of about \$241,000. Trustees, in previous discussions, have identified projects for which the funds could be spent but these improvements total \$597,000.

## Breakdowns nag Nankin bus line

While the Nankin Transit Commission appears to have resolved financial woes that plagued its early operation, bus breakdowns are becoming a problem.

The NTC has provided transportation for senior citizens and the handicapped in Westland, Garden City, Wayne and Inster since September 1976, last year adding Canton Township to its ridership area.

"Now, says NTC chairman Glenn Shaw, some of the 11 buses operated by the NTC are experiencing breakdowns that are affecting its ability to provide service.

"We're starting to run into problems that we've seen coming for a few weeks," said Shaw. "A report on the vehicles shows that the breakdown expense is greater than the service provided."

"Some of our vehicles are now in the 60,000 to 100,000 mile range."

Shaw said of the 11 vehicles leased from the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMATA), one used to be kept as a backup when breakdowns occurred. Breakdowns are now becoming so frequent, however, Shaw said that more vehicles are needed as backups.

Last Friday two vehicles were being repaired, one of which could take as long as 10 days to repair an engine and transmission at a cost of about \$2,000.

"This very definitely affects our operation," said Shaw. "When all 11 buses are running, we have to turn down about half a dozen passengers a day. But when there's a breakdown, that jumps to about 25 to 30 people immediately. Our schedule for Monday was filled by 9:30 a.m. Friday."

"We could expand past our current 5,500 a month ridership if we had more vehicles. I expect we will peak out somewhere around 7,000 riders a month," he added.

Meanwhile, Shaw is looking for more buses to fill the gap caused by the break downs.

"I keep going to SEMATA asking for

more buses, and I've asked Livonia Mayor (Edward) McNamara for support down at SEMTA. I'm not asking for new buses, just anything better than what we've got now. But SEMTA has said there won't be more buses until the state decides on funding for its transportation programs," explained Shaw.

"One of the reasons I wanted Canton Township added was because they had two vehicles to lease."

He said he will testify Jan. 18 before the state House transportation committee.

A recently completed audit of NTC's financial operations, however, shows that the commission is no longer hampered by delays in receiving financial reimbursements.

Those delays had prompted the NTC to borrow money from its member cities to fund its operation. Finally the NTC asked the cities for \$40,000 to establish a cash flow account. "That wasn't going to be reimbursed, but after we got the cash flow account we got \$40,000 from SEMTA. So now we're considering refunding the cities that money," said Shaw.

NTC's audit showed an ending fund balance of \$4,396. Total expenditures were \$156,000 of which nearly \$102,000 was spent on salaries and wages.

Revenues amounted to \$160,400. NTC received nearly \$63,000 in reimbursements from SEMTA and nearly \$87,000 in reimbursements from the federal Comprehensive Employment Training Act fund. Revenue from bus fares amounted to \$3,456.

Shaw said he expects this year's budget to total about \$250,000. The increase he said, reflects NTC's growth from six vehicles to 11.

Besides contracts with SEMTA and CETA for funding, each city provides NTC with in-kind services, such as office space, and additional funding on proportions based on population. Westland is responsible for 46.08 per cent, Garden City for 22.24 per cent and the remaining percentage funded by the other cities.

Speaking from the administration's standpoint, his presence will be missed. We wish him well in his endeavors and in his own business ventures.

**YACK REPORTS THAT** the school board will use the same procedure to find a replacement for Lawton as it did when it appointed Carol Davis to replace Ms. Borowski who resigned last year when her husband accepted an out-of-town position.

The community is familiar with that procedure and so we'll follow it," the board president said Friday. "We'll announce the vacancy and any resident wanting to serve on the school board can send a letter of interest." He expects the position might be filled

by the end of this month, depending on the timetable the board sets tonight for interviewing candidates.

"For me personally, and I'm sure for others on the board, Lawton's resignation letter came as a surprise," says Yack, "but we had, of course, realized that business at the credit union was keeping George very busy because of its growth.

"We will miss George's ability to bring about a compromise in awkward and stressful conditions because he was a master of that. When we reached those situations where it seemed there was no basis for compromise, it seemed George always would come up with one.

"We also will lose some sense of stability on the board. There's been quite a changeover in the past three to four years. We are down to the point

where I have the most tenure with four years, and that's not much experience."

In looking back on his concerns as a trustee, Lawton comments: "For any public government, I have always been interested in fiscal responsibility and sound management programs. For schools, I have been especially interested in having educational programs broad enough to serve all areas of the youth population of the community.

"I have never had any particular axe to grind or pre-determined position. My primary interest has been with the end product, not the means.

"Over the years I have become convinced that the very success of democracy hinges on the willingness of qualified people to serve in office. And so I do hope that qualified individuals will express an interest in the trustee position."

Although Lawton always has been busy at the credit union, as treasurer and manager, that responsibility increased when the credit union opened a branch office in Northville last September.

while the suspect who was released is fair-skinned.

The three women went to the National Bank of Detroit in Westland Wednesday where a safety deposit box was rented in the name of the widow. The five bank bags which were deposited later were found to contain "about \$100,000 in play money," Det. Allen said. Police believe a switch was made by the two con artists which enabled them to retain the front money that was originally in the package.

**AS A GESTURE** of good faith, the widow was persuaded by the pair to cash in \$12,613 of her own savings bonds and time deposit certificates to lend to the attorney's employee which she said she would use to bail her boyfriend out of jail. Police said Friday they don't know if they'll ever learn the identity of this woman or the male on the phone who represented himself as an attorney.

# Ford Road hearing is Wednesday

The highway department is inviting Canton residents and business people to come to a local meeting this week to air their views on the proposed widening of Ford Road through the township.

Citizens are encouraged to come to a "pre-study meeting" conducted by the Michigan Department of State Highway and Transportation Wednesday from 4-8 p.m. at the meeting hall in Fire Station No. 1, located at Canton Center at Cherry Hill.

The state road survey report singles Ford Road out as inadequate to handle the present traffic, let alone new business and residential growth coming into Canton. In any highway expansion project, the state highway department must conduct public hearings before preliminary plans are drawn up. The area targeted for expansion starts east of the I-275 expressway and extends west to Canton Center.

Canton Supervisor Harold Stein has been pressuring the highway department to widen Ford Road to accommodate present business and residential users and attract new ones.

But highway officials stress that in addition to hearing from people who want the two-lane primary road widened, they want to hear from people who could be adversely affected by the road expansion.

That day the widow later also went to the First Federal Savings Bank in Westland to withdraw \$40,000 from her savings account in the form of a cashier's check. Numerous unsuccessful attempts to cash that check were made before the woman went home for the night Wednesday.

Leonard Goodlesky watched the con artist, her victim and the security guard go to a bank in Wayne, The Detroit Police 1st Precinct, a downtown bonding agency, and then back to Westland Mall for some more shopping.

Police picked up the suspect they had under surveillance after questioning the widow. On Friday, the widow learned that she had \$100,000 in play money in her new safety deposit box.

# Winter snow tips

But Popular Mechanics magazine's December issue offers some worthwhile tips to those who would like to be snow-smart drivers.

- Downshift before hills to keep even traction on the way up.
- Never spin your wheels. That action will simply dig you in deeper.
- Always use extra weight in the rear for better traction—90 pounds of

salt secured in the trunk over the rear axle can serve a dual purpose.

• Don't attempt to power through a snowdrift, but feed power slowly beforehand and let momentum carry you through. Stop to clear snow from the radiator or risk a boilover.

• Keep your wheels straight and avoid sharp turns.

• If you start to skid on snow or ice, release brakes within fractions of a second before the skid converts to a spin-out.

• Keep moving at a moderate, even speed.



Those last few minutes when Michigan was on the verge of pulling victory out of apparent defeat she never will forget.

"Gad, how we screamed and yelled for Michigan to come through, but it was to no avail. They lost, but we still were proud of those Michigan players. You can bet I'll be in that stadium season to see them win."

There she was—seated at a table visiting with a nurse, an aide and another patient.

She looked wonderfully well. The old sparkle was back and her greeting was warm. After being introduced to her friends, she said, "Come on, I want to show you my room." Came in hand, she led the way, explaining that she had graduated from a walker.

She had a cheerful word for everyone as we traversed the hallways and lounges. And there were more introductions.

"This is home," she said. "Everyone is so nice."

The semi-private room was small but pleasant. She has her own chest of drawers and wardrobe. The hand-crocheted afghan identified her bed.

"Such lovely gifts."

The evening ended with Christmas cake and ice cream, provided and served by the club members.

The Salvation Army is another regular visitor to the home. Christmas packages for each resident included an orange, an apple, comb, tooth paste and tooth brush.

Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church was well-represented—scouts, CCD class and individual families of the parish.

"They must have asked for gift suggestions for each of us," said Kay. Each family sort of adopted a resident of the home.

"A young man and his 5 year old son came to visit me. He said his wife couldn't come. They stayed and talked and gave me this crewel picture and three packs of Camels." Kay already had completed the needlework and had it in its wooden frame.

PAT VINGSNESE, secretary, and Marguerite Hawker, in-service director, said they had many thank you letters to write. "Some individuals just dropped things off and we didn't have an opportunity to get their names or thank them," said Ms. Vingsnese.



## Real bash planned for Pierrot's 80th

They're planning an unusual trick on George Pierrot, one of the country's best-known connoisseurs of good food, when he celebrates his 80th birthday at the Detroit Art Institute on Wednesday.

About 2,000 members of his army of friends are planning a real bash from 6-9 p.m. without serving dinner. It possibly will be the first time in his life that the little round man, who has eaten in almost every restaurant in the country, will be at a birthday party without food.

What it lacks in food, the party will make up in a most unusual way. To accommodate the thousands expected to be on hand, the affair will be held in three rooms in the institute. The rooms will be named for special points in Hawaii from which the jovial traveler has just returned.

George, himself, will hold forth in the Kresge Court which will be named the Royal Court for the evening. The north wing will be the Oahu room, the Recital Room will become the Hali Oki Bowl, the auditorium will be the Oki Auditorium, while the south wing will be the Kapiolani Room where the dancing, featuring several Hawaiian numbers, will take place.

It is an unusual program, but George is an unusual person. And the

party promises to be one of the most unusual in the history of Detroit society.

Imagine a party with more than 2,000 guests, and you can get some idea of the manner in which one of the world's greatest travelers and one of its greatest gourmet diners will be ushered into the eighth decade of his life.

Throughout the three-hour period, George, who made a name for himself with the Sunday afternoon World Travel Adventure Series at the institute and for his penchant for good food wherever it is to be found, will be the subject of many a fine yarn.

One of the stories they tell of his familiarity with the best places to get certain foods concerns the year the Tigers won the pennant in 1968. In a relaxing moment, some of the nation's top sports writers decided to select an all-American meal with the dishes they most enjoyed in the various cities of their travels.

George happened to be within hearing distance and had his ear cocked to

get the writers' choices. When they agreed on shrimp at Sharkey's in Orlando, Fla. as a starter, George could contain himself no longer.

"And don't forget oxtail soup at Shevlin's in Cincinnati," he called over to the writers' table.

On another occasion, so the story goes, a group of Detroiters happened to be in Honolulu attending what was supposed to be an official luau—the peak of Hawaiian cuisine.

When one of the group complained about eating "burned pig" and said he would give anything for a good steak, a voice from another table called, "You can't beat the steak at Candlis right up the avenue." Sure enough, it was George Pierrot calling to his distraught fellow traveler. He knows the places and if the food is good, is certain to have dined there.

A regular at the annual WJR holiday party, George is the center of attention as he walks along the food line to fill his plate. And he is a picture when he starts devouring the roast beef at the Raleigh House or Ren Cen. A diner par excellence, you will find him at the most unexpected places, and no other man in Detroit can recite the menus of the best eating establishments, for he has dined in all of them.

It will be a great night for George. Not only will he be celebrating his 80th birthday, but he will be celebrating the 44th anniversary of the World Adventure Series that is one of the most popular entertainments in all of Michigan.

He started the series on a hunch, and for more than four decades has been offering the series. He also was on television until a short time ago, and won his way into the hearts of many with the programs on the tube.

The effect of these TV shows is best attested to by the story of an elderly gent who was listening to several of his friends tell of their experiences in Europe. They were talking about walking up the avenue in Paris to the River Seine, when the elderly gent said, "And if you had looked to your left, you would have seen the Cathedral of Notre Dame."

"When were you there?" one of the group asked.

The old gent smiled and said, "I never was there in person, but I learned it all from George Pierrot's travel series on television. I used to have a longing to travel. But when Pierrot started his shows, I gave up the idea. I now spend my vacations at home. I have seen more of these famous places on his show than if I had been there myself."

Pierrot is not a native Detroit, although he is looked upon as Mr. Detroit. He was born in Chicago, and after wandering out to the west coast, he came to Detroit in 1922 to take on a job as associate editor of Business magazine. From there he went over to the staff of the American Boy and Youth Companion magazines, where he provided youths with exciting tales of adventure.

It was through this work that he attracted the attention of the late Edsel Ford, who encouraged him to start the World Adventure Series to help finance the art institute. It was a success from the start.

It would take more than one volume to do justice to the little round man and his salutary influence on Detroit and Detroiters. For his sense of humor has kept the town laughing.

And as George would have it, the money from the admission charge (\$15 per person) to the big party will be used to redecorate the institute, especially the 50-year-old auditorium, which he always refers to as "my home away from home."

But the most unusual feature of the big evening will be the mammoth birthday celebration for the greatest diner in the country—and there will be no dinner.

## Plymouth hoopsters pummel loop opponents

### Canton controls Northville, 61-51

Plymouth Canton eaggers outscored Northville 20-11 in the final period, turning a close game into an easy 61-51 victory Friday night at the Canton gymnasium.

The victory raised the Chiefs' overall record to 3-4 but more importantly raised their Western Six League mark to 2-1. The conference crown is up for grabs since all six squads have suffered at least one loss in loop action.

The lead changed hands eight different times during the first three quarters of play as neither team could take a commanding lead. Canton led 41-40 going into the final period.

The Chiefs then switched to a full court man-to-man defense in the final eight minutes and caused numerous Mustang turnovers to gain control for the easy victory.

Junior guard Butch Kipp, who sat the bench during the entire third period with four fouls, sparked Canton's offensive attack in the final quarter with three quick baskets and six free throws. King finished with 18 points to pace all scorers.

"We were much looser and relaxed tonight," said Canton coach Casey Cavell. "I had the feeling we would get that six and eight point lead eventually."

"Our full court man-to-man press broke up Northville pattern game," the Canton mentor said. "We played good defense in the second half and didn't foul in that final quarter."

"It was an enjoyable game."

Canton's senior captain Randy Rienas followed King in the scoring with 16 points.

Joe Schimp led Northville with 17 points. John Horvath followed with 12 and Doug Harding added 10.

Russ Mandie played a strong board game for the Chiefs, pulling down 14 rebounds. Mandie and Rienas had five assists apiece.

Northville grabbed a slim 12-9 lead after the first quarter and maintained the three-point margin at halftime, 28-25. The Chiefs outscored the Mustangs 16-12 in the third period to take the one-point lead into the fourth quarter.

Chief Keith Fuelling returned to the line up for his first full time duty during the final quarter and played excellent defense against the Mustang star guard John Horvath. Fuelling missed the first five games of the season with an ankle injury.

The Chiefs host Farmington High School in a non-league game Tuesday night and travel to Waterford Mott Friday for another league game.

### Salem smokes Trenton, 91-42

As things turned out, the only thing in question Friday night when Plymouth Salem hosted Trenton in a Suburban Eight boys' basketball game was by how big a margin the unbeaten Rocks would get.

They finally settled for a 49-point margin, 91-42, as they completely overwhelmed the smaller, slower visiting Trojans in every phase of play to run their overall mark to 8-0 and their Sub 8 record to 3-0.

However, lest coach Fred Thomann's troops start counting their chickens before they hatch in their dream of extending Salem's Sub 8 title monopoly through a fifth successive winter let them be forewarned that trouble lies immediately ahead.

LIVONIA BENTLEY, which is the Sub 8 co-leader and also unbeaten in league action—with a 6-1 record overall, will invade the Plymouth lair Tuesday evening for a first place tie-breaker. In this renewal of an intense, longtime rivalry, victory by any margin—be it only one point—is the goal. "Bentley goes 6-5, 6-6 and 6-6 across the front line," commented Rock head coach Thomann.

The Rocks have beaten the Bulldogs 10 of the 11 times they've met during his Salem coaching reign. "We're going to have to handle their inside size and they must deal with our outside quickness. It could be one hell of a ball game."

AGAINST TRENTON, Salem had such a hot hand from the opening tipoff that the Rocks shot into a 13-1 lead before the Trojans could change their first goal from the field midway through the first period, which ended with Plymouth on top, 17-5.

With reserves playing a major role in boosting the halftime edge to 37-13, the starting quintet of Tom Ellinghausen, Mike Christie, John Broderick, Doug Agnew and Rich Hewlett took over again in the third stanza for what Thomann called "their best eight minutes so far this season."

Repeated magnificent execution of the fast break saw the Rocks click on 16 of their 18 field goal attempts in that stretch, with Ellinghausen collecting 14 of his game-leading 24 points in that period alone.

Steve Horton, 6-6 No. 2 center, came off the bench to drop in eight buckets for 16 points on his hottest night of the campaign, with Broderick picking up 11 points as the only other Rock in double figures.



## Pop therapies good for laugh

"Semi-Tough" (R) is fully funny. The colorful characters leap out of Dan Jenkins' raunchy novel about pro football, but the emphasis has changed considerably.

Scriptwriter Walter Bernstein and director Michael Ritchie have penetrated the pigskin paradise of male chauvinism and stolen the oink.

Cult followers of Jenkins' sports stories might be chagrined, but to the uncommitted viewer, the movie's a fair catch. Among other things, it's a tough-talking but old-fashioned triangle about two guys who discover they're in love with the same girl. Mostly, it's a hip putdown of the gurus of pop psychology.

"Semi-Tough" melds the national devotion to football with the national devotion to self-potential, self-realization, consciousness-raising programs, Movagenics, pelting and BEAT (closely resembling est) are the fictional therapies exposed to mockery.

**TRADITIONAL SOURCES** of solace also take some rib jabs from the satirist's elbow. During lulls in a wedding ceremony, the minister (Fred Stuthman) and the BEAT director (Bert Convy), who are jointly conducting the service, find they share a common interest in tax shelters and Caribbean banking.

Juggling romance, BEAT and footballs are tight-end Billy (Clyde Puckett (Burt Reynolds) and wide receiver Shake Tiller (Kris Kristofferson), two jovial jocks on a mythical Miami football team. They share a mod apartment and a playful camaraderie with Barbara Jane Bookman (Jill Clayburgh), the team owner's daughter.

Ironically, the coarsest language is snapped out by Barbara Jane, who salts her conversation with locker-room zingers while looking like the loveable, sweet girl next door. Her two big lug friends are likely to respond with "Aw shucks, ain't she something?"

Kristofferson and Reynolds play their roles with gusto. Reynolds again confirms his flair for comedy and his endearing ability to mock his own sexy image.

As a sober-sided convert to BEAT, Kristofferson has a less viable role, but one well suited to his deadpan style. After a marathon 48-hour encounter session, he's found "it," but his fiancee, Barbara Jane, hasn't. Straight-faced, he discusses with Billy Clyde (who's trying to work a personal draw play) whether such a "mixed marriage" can work.

**THERE'S A WEALTH** of fine acting in the numerous supporting roles. Robert Preston is booming and bigger than life as Big Ed, the Texas millionaire and team owner. He crawls around on all fours and pushes the merits of "movagenics" with the same enthusiasm he uses to peddle trombones in "The Music Man." Lotte Lenya is diabolical as Clara Pelf, the original pounding peller.

Somehow, most of the characters emerge quite likeable, maybe it's the charm of the country music. Gene Autry's "Back in the Saddle Again."

The gridiron scenes smack of bravado and crunching impact. However, the real clash occurs in the pre-game interview when the two team captains argue the relative benefits of BEAT versus pyramid power.

"Semi-Tough" is a raucous riot of a film, sometimes gross, but very often witty.
