## New towers of power

# Edison's beefing up

That new row of high voltage power lines isn't being installed through Canton's midsection because you fell asleep with the TV on.

And, contrary to many people's belief, it is not specifically being constructed because of the area's recent housing boom.

"The new tower line is an addition to southeastern Michigan's network of power transmission," explains Peter Georges, Detroit Edison's director of customer marketing service in Wayne County. "It is strengthening the backbone of our bulk power distribution system."

New customers in western Wayne County and over in Washtenaw County (served by Consumers Powers) had something to do with the need for more high voltage, but the electrical companies see things in a much larger scale than just western Wayne County or even metropolitan Detroit.

Power that is generated at a generating plant in Port Huron may be used immediately in the Monroe area, even though Monroe is the site of another electrical power plant.

The routing of bulk electricity is handled by a pool computer in Ann Arbor.

Canton already has two rows of high voltage towers that will be on either side of the new row. The existing towers transmit bulk voltage of 120,000 volts and the new row of towers will support cables carrying 345,000 volts. The Wayne power station at Cherry Hill and Morton Taylor and Washtenaw County's Coventry station will be connected with the additional circuits.

WORKMEN WERE scheduled to finish stringing the line through Canton Township by the end of March. But company spokesmen now say the blizzard and bitter cold delayed construction so the end of April is now listed as the target date for completion of construction in Canton.

When the line is completed, the electricity will travel at a speed of 186,282 miles per second (the speed of light). Even power from Ontario, Canada will be able to be transmitted.

"Because of the excellent working relationship we have with Consumers and Ontario Hydro-electric, we are helping to conserve our coal reserves during the strike," Georges said. "In the respect that we are close to Canada here in southeastern Michigan, we are more fortunate than electrical companies in Indiana, say, and Ohio."

Alternating current cannot be "stored" to conserve energy, Georges points out. And electrical demands fluctuate greatly during the day. Different areas need electricity at different times. So, the electricity is routed continually to various substations in the region. At the substations, the high voltage, bulk electrical current is converted into a lower distribution voltage of 13,200.

Although some large factories receive current at voltages as high as 120,000 volts, most industrial plants and shopping centers use between 4,800 and 13,000 volts. Homes use 120 volts in normal outlets and 240 volts for heavy equipment.

## Food firm will build with aid

After six months of negotiation with township administrators, the president of Grosse Pointe Quality Food Company has announced he intends to build a distribution center at the southwest corner of Haggerty and Michigan Ave. with tax-free revenue bonds.

The company has already submitted its application to Canton's Economic Development Corporation (EDC), and has paid the required \$750 filing fee.

Grosse Pointe Food's president, Frederick L. Hite, said the company, a division of Farm House Foods of Milwaukee, would like to take advantage of the 2-2/2 per cent savings over conventional financing available through an economic development corporation.

In correspondence to Supervisor Harold Stein, Hite said he has not taken bids on the project yet, but estimates construction cost will be \$4-1/2 million.

Industrial projects formed under an EDC program can receive up to \$5 million in tax-free revenue bonds issued by a municipality's EDC, at no liability to that branch of government. Interest on the revenue bonds are exempt from all federal state and local income tax with certain limitations.

According to Internal Revenue Code, a project can be financed up to \$1 million free of any restrictions on capital expenditures, or \$5 million subject to the limitation that the company's capital expenditures in that one location does not exceed \$5 million.

Once capital expenditures go over the \$5 million mark, the revenue bonds issued by the EDC in a municipality lose their tax-exempt status.

THE BUILDING as planned would be 245,000 square feet, and contain groceries, frozen foods, processed meat and deli items to be shipped to southeastern Michigan and northern Ohio.

If the funding goes through, the plant would employ 185 people, "many will come from Canton Township and many of the employees now working for us . . . would relocate to Canton Township and western Wayne County," Hite projects the building to be completed by May 15, 1979.

A number of public hearings must be conducted before any project can receive tax-free bonds from the EDC. Hearings on the Grosse Pointe Foods proposal will be scheduled this spring, but no specific date has been set.

The township's EDC can approve more than one EDC project as long as the applicants are not related financially.

In fact, a smaller business, West Side Auto Parts also submitted a EDC project application last Thursday. Supervisor Harold Stein, a member of the EDC, encourages more businesses to apply for the tax incentive, saying the program could benefit business and expand Canton's commercial tax base.

Stein noted that there will be no property tax break or exemption for companies in the EDC program.

## Recreation boss resigns abruptly

Brenda Pollack, Canton Township's recreation director for the past 5 1/2 years resigned abruptly Monday morning, charging Supervisor Harold Stein pressured her into quitting through "harrassment of my job capabilities."

Contacted at home in a phone interview with the Canton Observer, Mrs. Pollack said that since Stein took office seven months ago, her supervisory role gradually diminished until "he put me in charge of women's sports and all the little things like that. He'd accuse me of things I didn't do."

But, pressed for further comment on the harrassment charge, Mrs. Pollack said she didn't want to say too much in criticism of Stein because her husband, Roger, works as a Canton Township fire fighter and she feared repercussions.

Mrs. Pollack handed in her letter of resignation 8:30 Monday morning, leaving the department without any notice. Later that day, Robert Suggs, a 58-year-old retiree, was hired at \$4.50 an hour, according to Stein, to work as temporary replacement in the director's position. Mrs. Pollack's job paid \$15,000 a year. Suggs was a member of the citizen recreation committee.

Township officials are presently reviewing applicants for another job in that same department. Ten applicants have submitted resumes for the newly-created job of superintendent of parks and recreation. Those who meet the hiring criteria will be tested by the Michigan Municipal League (MML).

APPLICATIONS FOR Mrs. Pollack's old job will also be taken and those applicants will be tested by the MML.

Mrs. Pollack said Tuesday that township officials never told her that a position above hers would be created until it already was. She said Stein kept her in the dark on important matters such as the purchase of the Fellow's Creek Golf Course and his plans for expanding the senior citizen program.

Until Stein took over, Mrs. Pollack was in charge of recreation and senior citizen activities.

Stein emphatically denies that Mrs. Pollack did not know the job of superintendent of parks and recreation was being created.

"I informed her by letter she could apply for that job," Stein said. "She never did."

The last contact he had with Mrs. Pollack, Stein says, is a meeting that was called Friday night to discuss a conflict that arose in scheduling two separate events in the recreation building at the same time.

According to both Stein and Mrs. Pollack, a group of pre-schoolers was still playing recreational games in the township's recreation building when the township's new senior citizen coordinator, Dale Hall, came in to use the room for senior citizens activities.

The meeting was called to resolve the conflict. It was attended by Mrs. Pollack, Stein, Mrs. Hall, Frank McMurray, chairman of the citizen recreation committee, and Clerk John Flodin. Stein said he attempted to work out the "lack of communication" at the meeting by telling Hall and Pollack to put aside their personal differences.

## Housing fund secure, says Stein

A recent federal district court ruling that the City of Livonia can't spend \$150,000 in federal funds because it did not plan for new, low-income housing will not directly affect the Plymouth-Canton community, according to officials.

Although Plymouth, Plymouth Township and Canton each receive separate Community Development Act (CDA) grants annually, the requirements for spending the money are different.

While Livonia has to plan for low-income housing with its community development funds, Plymouth and

Canton only are required to use the grants to "directly assist" low- and moderate-income persons.

"We're not going to be bothered by this ruling," said Canton Supervisor Harold Stein. "We've had meetings with Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the fair housing people and

others. We've provided for every walk of life."

Mark Wollenweber, assistant city administrator for Plymouth, said the only effect he could see would be more stringent spending guidelines for small communities.

"The Wayne County Office of Program Development has just put out new regulations this week, but nobody here has had a chance to see them yet."

LAST WEEK, U.S. District Judge Robert E. DeMascio ruled that Livonia could not spend \$150,000 in unused CDA block grant funds because the city had not provided new housing for low-income persons.

HUD also was named a plaintiff in the suit, which was filed several years ago by the Coalition for Block Grant Compliance, the Detroit NAACP and three individuals who said they could not find affordable housing in Livonia.

Michael Gorman, Canton's deputy treasurer, said that because Canton, Plymouth and Plymouth Township are not "prime sponsors" in the block grant program, they are not obligated to use their CDA funds to create housing.

In fact, he said, the county regulations prevented communities which were not prime sponsors from spending their block grant money on building new low-income housing.

To be a prime sponsor a community must have a population of at least 50,000. Prime sponsor communities, like Livonia, receive grants directly from HUD.

Communities of less than 50,000 receive their block grant funds from the Wayne County program development office, which gets the money from HUD.

Besides dispensing funds to communities, the county is responsible for insuring that projects financed with the grants comply with HUD regulations.

## Jeff's back after crash for birthday

Jeff Shrewsbury was given a surprise birthday party at Isbister Elementary School when he turned 11 Tuesday.

Tuesday also was Jeff's first day back to school after being hospitalized for weeks as the result of injuries sustained in a airplane crash which took the life of his father and sister.

The airplane crash was in November near Knoxville, Tenn. Thomas J. Shrewsbury, 34, of Plymouth Township and Laura, 13, were killed in the crash in a wilderness area about 30 miles south of Knoxville.

At the time, Jeffrey and sister Jennifer, 8, had managed to stay alive despite being exposed to 40 m.p.h. winds and 27 degree temperatures for almost 30 hours. They both had suffered broken backs and other injuries.

Both were hospitalized for many weeks, Jeff for about three months. Jennifer, a third grader at Isbister, was able to return to school after the Christmas break but Jeff didn't return until Tuesday.

And his return was heralded by the entire school as well as his classmates. Because his first day back also was his 11th birthday, Jeff's class planned the surprise party. The room

# A shopping list for six years

Plymouth City Commission at its March 20 meeting will attempt to narrow down a six-year shopping list.

Monday night the city commission was presented with a Six Year Capital Improvement Program (1978-83).

The program was approved by the planning commission at its Feb. 8 meeting and presented to city commissioners Monday by William A. Leonard, chairman of the planning commission.

The list includes several capital improvement projects which could be

undertaken, without any prioritizing or cost estimates being developed.

City commissions will now review the list and discuss it at the March 20 session.

AMONG THE PROPOSED projects listed in the six-year plan are:

Band shell replacement when needed; beautification of city parks; construction of left turn lanes at intersections such as Harvey and Ann Arbor Road, Penniman Avenue at Sheldon, and Ann Arbor Trail at Sheldon; city hall expansion, including an

elevator or annex; continuation of crack sealing road program; equipment fund to set aside funds each year for future equipment purchases; expansion of Tonquish Creek Manor; and expressway identification for the city.

Other items included were: a feasibility study for consolidation of services between city and Plymouth Township; library expansion; Main Street underpass at junction of E&O tracks and Main; Mill and Main intersection improvements; a mini-bus for senior

citizens; continued redevelopment of Old Village; parking signs designating location of city lots; parking system improvements; purchase of aerial ladder truck; realign Church Street at Main.

Also: Sewer system evaluation study; recreational facilities; sidewalk ramp construction; sidewalk on Sheldon Road; smoke protector program; street reconstruction and improvement; traffic flow survey, after completion of M-14; traffic light signal at Ann Arbor Trail and Union; and, continuation of tree planting program.

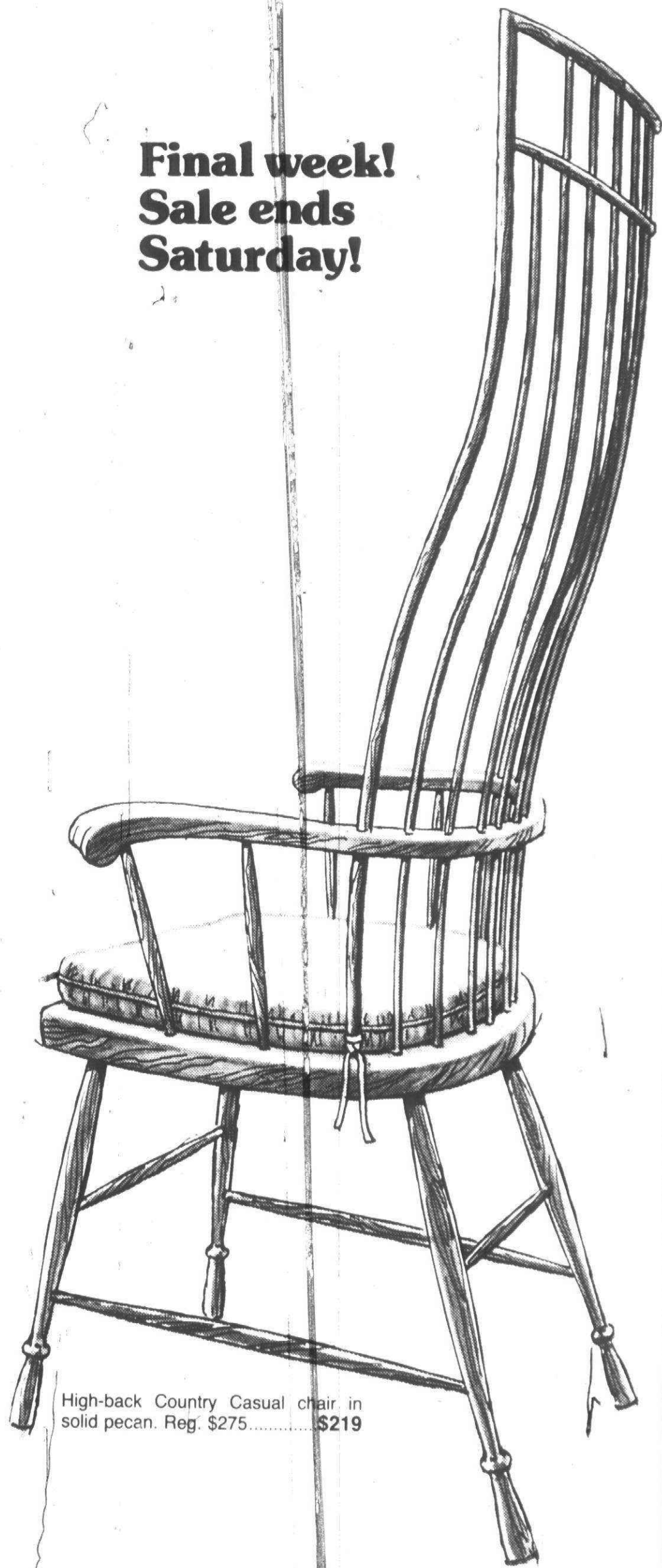

# Artist DeLauro puts his heart into stone

It is not true that people from Canton Township who show an affinity for fine art are banished to another country. It just looks that way.  
Joseph DeLauro happens to head the School of Fine Arts at the University

of Windsor in Ontario. But he spends his evenings at home with his family on Bricklan St. in Canton.  
At the age of 62, DeLauro must be one of the area's most prolific sculptors.  
His work is displayed in places as

dissimilar as Windsor's Hiram Walker Distillery (where he did an 11-foot fountain figure of an Indian maiden riding on the back of a Canadian goose) to the modern, multi-colored altar screen that can be found inside St. Scholastica Catholic Church

in Detroit.  
Locally, the statue of the Madonna in the courtyard of Livonia's Madonna College was done by DeLauro. But he doesn't like to admit it anymore.  
According to DeLauro, the college administrators commissioned him to sculpt a Madonna for the school's grounds. He said he learned later that his statue was surrounded by sculptures of children, done by someone else. The addition distracts and detracts from his piece, DeLauro claims.

"IT HAD SOMETHING to do with Our Lady of Fatima," said the sculptor. "But it had no relation to the statue already there. I made me feel very sad."

Intact examples of DeLauro's artistry can be found all over metropolitan Detroit.

Vistors to Detroit's main library view his "Dancing Girl" at the library's entrance on Cass. Tennis buffs see a companion piece, also entitled "Dancing Girl," in the lobby of the Dearborn Tennis Club.

However, the best place to find examples of DeLauro's artistry is a church, since most of the work he's been commissioned to do is of a religious nature.

In fact, two of his largest commissioned works deal with Christ—one concerns Christ's crucifixion and the other has to do with His resurrection.

After being commissioned by the Des Plaines Mausoleum to carve a Pieta in marble, DeLauro moved his family and studio to Italy for the 1974 year.

There, DeLauro picked out the chunk of white marble for his work at the mountainside and worked with a pneumatic drill on the statue in Florence, surrounded by some of the finest examples of Renaissance sculpture remaining.

THE PIETA is a popular theme in religious art, the most famous being Michaelangelo's version. DeLauro's interpretation shows Christ being embraced by His mother Mary and also Joseph of Armithea, the man who gave his tomb to the crucified King of the Jews.

"Over the years I've found I've enjoyed most of the things I've done," DeLauro said. "But the most difficult or demanding piece was the Pieta. Because you have to compose three figures that are interrelated into a whole."

"Joseph of Armithea was not a Christian," DeLauro explains, "but he had compassion and the understanding that they'd just crucified a very innocent man."

The highest compliment paid to his work, DeLauro said, came from a townsman in Florence watching him complete the Pieta.

"He said it was like two mountains with Christ flowing like water between them. St. Thomas of Aquinas said we must use natural forms to express supernatural ideas, as Christ used parables. So, I try to use embraceable forms in my work."

The Catholic concept of the Holy Trinity, where God is the union of three divine figures—the Father, Son and Holy Spirit—is evident in DeLauro's 12-foot bronze statue "The Resurrection."

In this work, Christ's robe forms three concentric circles and the hands and feet form a triangle.

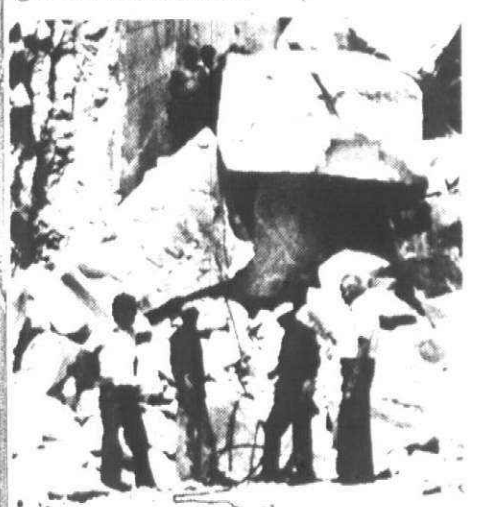
DeLauro emphasizes that he is not just a religious artist, that he does not limit himself just to sculpture and enjoys teaching and working with modern materials such as fiberglass.

He admits he originally went into teaching art as insurance against artist's unemployment. But, after 18 years at the University of Windsor—and Marygrove and the University of Detroit before that—he has no real regrets.

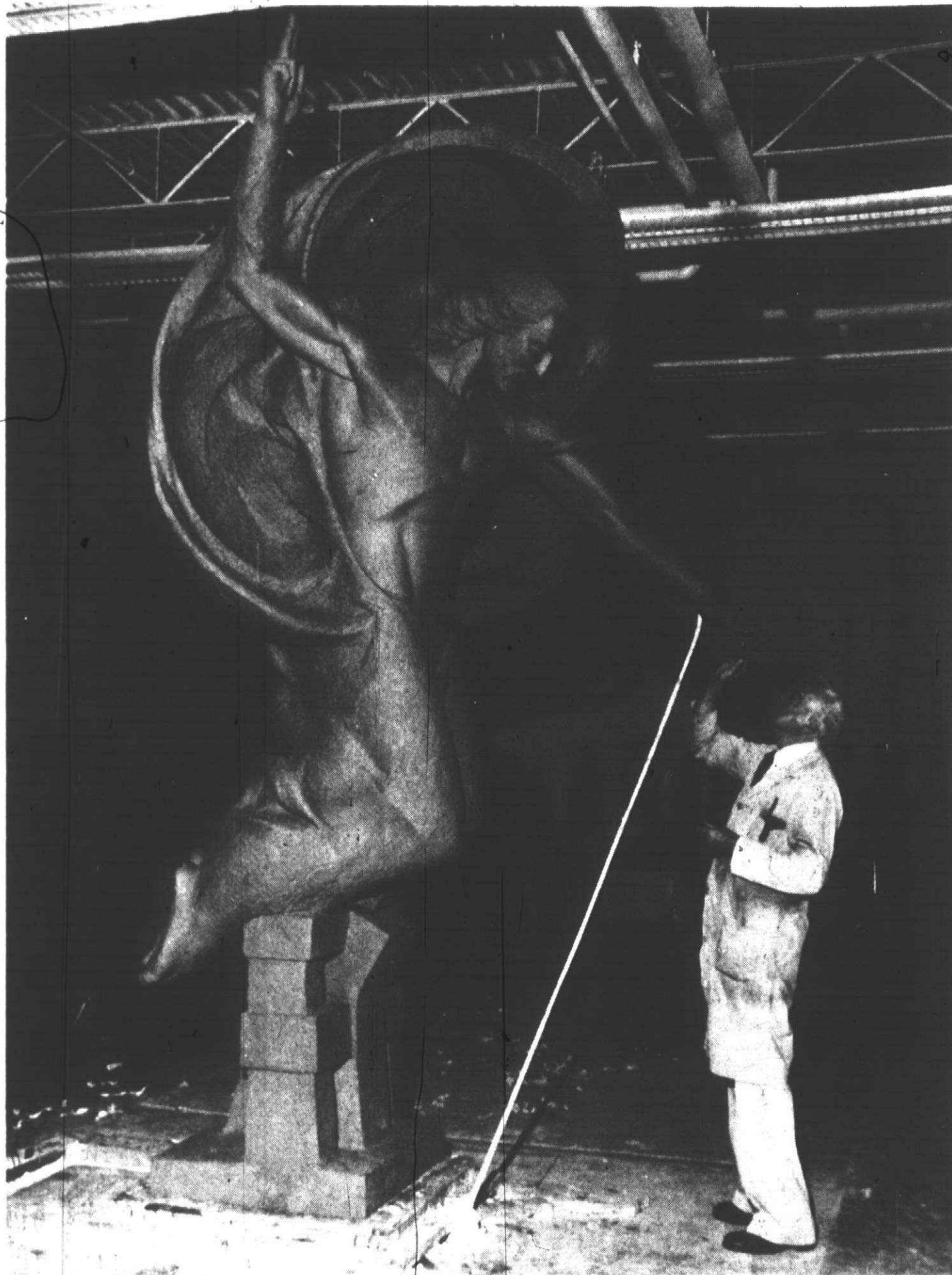
"Whatever commission I take on, whether it's a portrait or a dancing girl, one has to understand first what he's doing," DeLauro said. "Then, you

give that project or pursuit that which you have to give. It doesn't have to be a religious ideal, it could be sensual in nature."

"But to understand and convey that quality is the task of the artist. If that's being religious, then I'm religious. I'm absorbed."



The only way to make sure you're getting the right piece of marble for a sculpture is to go to the mountain and pick it out, DeLauro says.

## Get a job from Growth Works

A young unemployment program has been launched by Growth Works, Inc. and Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The federally-funded program will provide paid work experience as well as career planning and life preparation instruction to 28 eligible youths.

The grant has been awarded through the Wayne County Office of Manpower, which also administers CETA (Comprehensive Employment Training Act) funds to local municipalities.

THE PROGRAM, called Youth Community Conservation and Improvement Project (YCCIP), will employ 28 between the ages of 16 and 19.

It is part of a broad range of youth employment demonstration projects throughout the country in an attempt to reduce the number of jobless youth.

The program will be administered directly by Growth Works—parent agency of the Youth Center and Our House. Supportive services, evaluation and consultation will be provided by the school district.

The project is particularly aimed at dropouts, adjudicated youth, and those from economically disadvantaged families. In particular females and minorities are to be served to satisfy the legislative intent of the program.

Most of the 28 spots already have been filled through referrals from high school counselors or administrators. However, a few spots remain unfilled.

THE PROGRAM will be structured to provide developmental services along with practical work experience. The actual work experience will

involve projects at park sites in the community, such as Griffin Park in Canton, West Point Park in Plymouth Township, and Tonquish Creek nature walkway in the City of Plymouth.

Work will include landscaping, construction of benches, fences and shelters, and cement work. Skills needed for electrical and plumbing work also will be demonstrated.

Of the 28 enrollees, 70 per cent will be from low-income families, and 80 per cent must have dropped out of school or evidenced poor school performance.

A total of 2½ staff positions will be used. A youth coordinator will manage the learning activities, counseling, and perform advocacy functions. A technical advisor will supervise actual work tasks, providing on-site guidance and instruction. A part-time person will supervise work experiences and assist in counseling.

The program started Feb. 15 and will run through Sept. 30, 1978. Enrollees will engage in 20 hours of program participation until the end of the school year and during September. Each participant will be paid \$2.65 an hour for instruction and work experiences.

The program will require participants to master basic areas like checkbook balancing, obtaining loans, purchasing automobiles, basic legal rights, and home health care.

The staff also will provide tutorial and small group instruction in basic skills—math, reading and writing—and offer an opportunity for a General Educational Development (GED) high school diploma.

## Shooting probe goes on

Last month's fatal shooting of a Plymouth Township man by two Wayne County sheriff's deputies is being "routinely investigated" by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office.

Deputies Wallace Dixon and George Supernois are still working on the road patrol during the investigation, according to Wayne County Det. Alex Robertson.

"If there were any question about the shooting, they might've been given a desk job during the investigation," Robertson said. "But, our own investigation shows they did a good job."

Vester Holland, 54, of Elmhurst Street in Plymouth Township was shot eight times Feb. 19 when deputies fired off 10 rounds at him. Police said Holland pointed a shotgun at one of the officers and appeared ready to fire at a deputy stationed at his side door.

Deputy Dixon was the first to fire, according to Det. Patterson. Supernois, heard the blast and thought Dixon had been shot.

So Supernois reportedly fired four shots in addition to the six shots that police say were fired by Dixon.

Another officer at the scene, Robert Walker, did not fire any shots, according to Robertson.

Holland died at 5:51 a.m., five hours after he was shot.

Police said it appeared that Holland had been drinking heavily, and said his wife had complained to police previously about her husband's violent behavior.

A neighbor called the deputies to the scene, police said.

## No sign of compromise

Local business people are still haggling with the Canton Township Planning Commission over what constitutes a reasonable business sign size.

And there's no sign of a compromise that is acceptable to the more militant members of the planning body and the members of the business community.

At Monday night's planning commission meeting, commissioners voted down a resolution that would have allowed 24-square-foot signs in a neighborhood-type commercial site, 50-

square-foot signs in regular commercial business zones and 50-square-foot signs plus an additional two-foot for every foot of frontage to provide for visibility.

That proposal, supported by Frank McMurray, Richard Kirchgatter and Bart Berg, was defeated 4-3 but another proposal is expected to be introduced at next Monday's meeting.

The Canton Chamber of Commerce has recommended that a 64-square-foot sign be allowed in neighborhood commercial centers, or C-1 zones.

"the county has the job of making sure enough low-income housing is being built throughout the county. But Livonia is responsible for designing its own housing program."

FRANK STEINER, a coordinator for the Coalition for Block Grant Compliance, also said that the communities were in no danger of losing federal money or being prohibited from spending 1978 grants.

"The small municipalities have no legal liability, but the county and HUD do," He added that if the non-prime sponsoring communities wanted to build more low-income housing they would have to apply for additional federal funds.

This year the City of Plymouth has applied for community development funds for part of the cost of widening the Mill and Main Street intersection, paying for new radios for the fire department, a study of Old Village to see if it qualifies as a low-income neighborhood, cosmetic improvements to Old Village, a fair housing seminar, a citywide sewer survey, and part of the total price for a new fire engine. The estimated amount of this year's block grant is \$100,000.

Plymouth Township expects to receive slightly more than \$120,000 and plans to use the money to separate the sanitary and storm sewer lines in one of the township's subdivisions.

Canton Township also expects to receive \$120,000 this year. The projects it wants to finance include renovating homes in a low-income subdivision, establishing the Folker house as a building for social service agencies and making the township fire station, which is used for governmental meetings, barrier-free in architectural design.

There may be several inches of snow and ice on the ground, but it's never too early to start thinking about the annual Hines Drive bicycle days.

State Rep. Robert Law (R-Livonia) is asking permission from the Wayne County Road Commissions and communities who have the drive in their boundaries to approve the dates.

Law said the county has given tentative approval to the dates of May 13, June 10, Sept. 9, and Oct. 14, all Saturdays.

It is expected that the bike days will follow the past pattern in which the drive is closed to auto traffic between 8:30 a.m.-4 p.m. between Ford and Haggerty. Law said that there will also be community activities scheduled as part of the bike days.

The bike days were started several years ago by State Rep. John Markes, who then represented the 36th House district.

Positive image needed

Hines Park not a war zone, says Law

Promoting a positive image is the key to getting more people to use Hines Park, according to State Rep. Robert Law (R-Livonia).

Law has been the driving force behind the Hines Park Task Force, an ad hoc committee of western Wayne County law enforcement and political figures concerned about the park's checkered reputation.

"It's not a war zone. It's not Central Park, but the overall image is a negative one," said Law.

The park in recent years has been described as a gathering place for drug dealers, teenage prostitutes and

rowdy, beer-drinking youths. Law said the park, to many people in western Wayne County, is no longer a attractive place to go.

"We're trying to persuade them that Hines Park is a desirable place to go. We're trying to encourage them to go back into the park," he said.

The Hines Park Task Force has come up with a comprehensive, inexpensive plan to beef up security in the park. This plan, Law said, would put "security personnel" on duty and help discourage potential trouble-makers.

He said each community bordering

the park has agreed to "donate" a Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) employee to the new security force.

The proposed force will not have police powers but will be under the direction of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

In all, 15 CETA employees will patrol the park in addition to the 26 deputies already assigned there.

Use of CETA employees means financially-strained Wayne County, which has trimmed a number of sheriff's programs over the past three years, would have to spend very little for the

new security patrol.

The new force would operate out of an old Wayne County Road Commission building at the corner of Newburgh Road and Hines Drive. The road commission has already agreed to transfer the building to the sheriff's department, Law said. The sheriff's department would also provide all the necessary communication equipment.

Law also raised the possibility of beefing up sheriff's patrols in the park.

He said the task force will propose that five sheriff's deputies be assigned to weekend road patrols in the park during the summer.

According to Law, the union representing the deputies has agreed to waive the overtime provisions of the deputies' contract in this instance.

This means that the sheriff's department, instead of hiring new officers, will assign five, two-man patrol cars to the park from Thursday through Sunday during the summer. And instead of paying overtime wages, the county will pay the officers straight wages plus compensatory time.

The union has come to the realization that the county is very short of money," said Jim Akhtar, president of the Wayne County Sheriff's Local 502

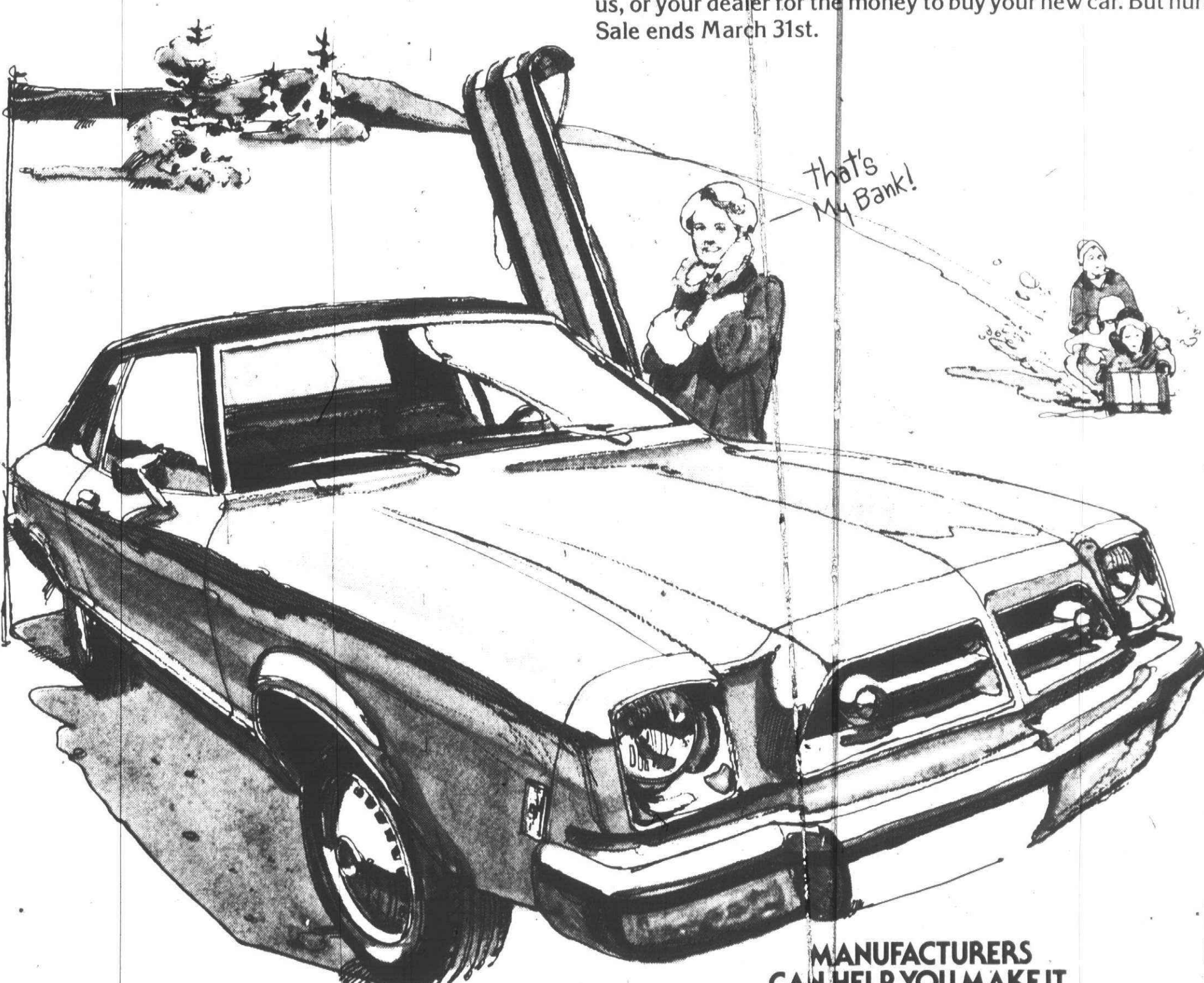

# Plymouth's 'legal burglar' reveals trade secrets

With a big, broad smile, Carl Hopfner leaned back in his chair in his office at 1270 S. Main Street in Plymouth and said, "I am the city's legal burglar."

That was his way of explaining that he was the area's locksmith and dealt with such activities as opening safes, unlocking cars, entering homes and apartment buildings and commercial establishments when owners were locked out.

"And, oh yes, I also make keys to fit any type of lock."

**THE NEW LITTLE SHOP**, open since November, is an interesting establishment in that every conceivable kind of lock is on display—along with the latest things in safes for both homes and commercial establishments.

As he sat at his desk, explaining the type of work he has done for the past six years, Hopfner admitted that being a locksmith was a far cry from the tasks he had performed until he reached retirement age.

"It may sound odd, but I was a member of the Detroit Fire Department, and when I started on that job, I never dreamed I'd wind up being a locksmith in Plymouth."

The big change in his life came when the time drew near for retirement and he had to think about what he would do. He didn't want to sit around and wait for old age to overtake him.

It so happened there was a locksmith shop near his home close by the City Airport at Connors and Gratiot Avenues. He dropped in one day, became interested, and, before he knew it, was on the way to a new career.

"The owner wouldn't take me on until I learned a bit so I spent a lot of time studying and then calling on people in trouble. After about six months I was given a part-time job. Then when the day came that I retired from the fire department, I had some activity to turn to for a livelihood."

**ADMITTING IT IS** a long way from the Detroit City Airport to Plymouth, Hopfner explained that he was attracted to Plymouth by several things.

"First, it is a growing area and secondly, the people seem so friendly and nice that I decided Plymouth was the place to settle down."

He had been taken in as a partner in the locksmith business in the city and later purchased the company. Now, he has taken his son in with him. The only thing missing to make the new set-up perfect is that he is having a difficult time finding a home in which to settle down for his retirement years.

In his new shop, Hopfner spends most of his time making keys and he is amazed that more people, when moving into new quarters, don't demand that all the locks be changed.

With this idea in mind he tells you that he'd much rather fix an old lock than sell a new one.

He was quick to point out that when a new house is purchased few persons realize all the workmen on the job—or most of them—have keys.

"It isn't necessary to replace the locks, but the points in the lock can be changed at a greatly reduced cost than purchasing new ones."

**THERE IS A HUMOROUS** side to being a locksmith, as he told of the oddest case he ever had, and that one just recently.

A short time ago he was called to the new I-275 expressway where a man with a truck had stopped at a gas station to have his gas tank refilled. He had a dog in the rear of the driver's seat and when he got down from the cab he left the motor running.

Then, like most dogs do, when the animal saw his master he leaped over the front seat and, accidentally, pushed down on the button and locked the car.

"It was all I could do to keep from laughing," Hopfner said, "but here was a dog that locked his owner out of his own truck."

One of the biggest troubles he finds these days has to do with aluminum keys. "People buy them because they are cheap. But the keys don't last and often break off in the locks."

Hopfner has come a long way in the locksmith business since the day he sauntered into the shop in the east side of Detroit, looking for something to do when he retired from the Detroit Fire Department.

He not only owns his own business, but is vice-president of the Michigan Locksmith's Association and a high ranking member of the national association.

He proudly tells you that one must qualify to gain membership in these organization by doing field work for at least a year and a half.

And as he looks at all of the new homes being built in the Plymouth-Canton area, he feels that this will be his home—if he can find a suitable dwelling. But he doesn't expect any more dogs to come to his aid by locking their owners in their own cars.

Tracking screens and UFO sightings have captured the imagination of the public once again thanks to "Close Encounters of the Third Kind." According to school officials the slick new movies may have helped make science fiction more popular with high school and college students, but there are other reasons for its growing popularity.

## Science fiction earns scholarly recognition

A whoosh, a roar and a burst of dazzling lights.

They used to be the staple of science-fiction novels. But things are changing. The action and excitement are still there, but pyrotechnics have been upstaged by serious social commentary. And drugstore pulp has entered the halls of academe.

"Sci-fi" has arrived as a literary form. High schools throughout the Detroit metropolitan area offer at least one science fiction elective. School officials in Birmingham and Livonia say science fiction is their most popular course.

One Detroit public high school offers 26 sections in science fiction—all are filled. Wayne State University and the University of Detroit offer high-level courses in the subject.

**BUT WHY** the new-found popularity?

According to Marshall Tymn, professor of English literature at Eastern Michigan University, the answer is simple: Science fiction is exciting, entertaining and relevant to young minds.

Tymn should know. He is a coordinator of the nation's largest annual gathering of teachers of science fiction. More than 200 teachers are expected on the EMU campus this spring for the conference's third meeting.

"Mainstream literature just is not furnishing any answers to younger readers about where we're heading," said Tymn.

"Science fiction literature is attractive. It's alive with mind-boggling concepts.

"It's probably more entertaining than mainstream literature. And younger readers are turned off by literature that doesn't entertain."

**TYMN SAID** today's science fiction readers, far from being lost in day-dreams, want to know what their alternatives are for the future.

"Science fiction deals with those alternative futures. Science fiction is giving the broad picture of the direction in which we may be heading. It deals with corruption, ecology, mismanagement in government. The emphasis is away from hard science."

The sci-fi of the 1970s, Tymn said, has come a long way from Flash Gordon, Buck Rogers and the monster invasions of the grade B Japanese movies.

Instead science fiction has gone "serious."

"Today's writers are not concerned with gadgets, monsters and computers coming to life," he said.

"Logan's Run" and "Soylent Green," were two recent science fiction films Tymn pointed to as examples of the new emphasis on contemporary and future social problems.

"Logan's Run wasn't a bad movie. It tried to portray what the future might be like," he said. That movie depicted a society in which no one was allowed to live past the age of 30—a "youth culture" gone berserk.

"Soylent Green" tried to portray a vastly over-populated world suffering from other ecological problems," he said.

However, "Star Wars," the biggest box office hit ever, wins no interstellar points from Tymn. "It was a highly entertaining movie, but it stressed special effects. It created a negative effect. It reinforces all the stereotypes. All it did was set science fiction back," he said.

**NEVERTHELESS**, Tymn acknowledges the media-hype surrounding "Star Wars" and "Close Encounters" has helped to extend the popularity of literature which had for a long time only a cult following.

"It's no longer a stigma to write science fiction. And the market is a lot easier to break into for a writer," Tymn said.

"And our writers are accessible. That's not always the case with mainstream writers," said Tymn.

"We can see the Isaac Asimovs, Peter B. Clarkes and Ray Bradburys."

"There are scores of conventions, and the writers never fail to make the rounds."

**CHARLES BUELL**, an English teacher at Birmingham's Seaholm High School, agreed with Tymn.

"The real value of science fiction is that it points to the changing role of the individual in the future," he said. After some consideration, he corrected himself, "It deal deals with the changing role of the future."

"It also lets the kids look at contemporary problems from new perspectives. It teaches them an awareness of some of the problems we now face," Buell said.

He added that many of things they read about in the "Martian Chronicles" and the "Science Fiction Hall of Fame" are not all that far-fetched.

"Look at some of the things they're doing at the University of Michigan—splitting DNA (the molecular blueprint for life). It was unheard of."

And at Eastern Michigan University, the physics department is even trying to promote interest in its specialty by teaching its own science fiction course.

# Boat access bill anchored again

"I don't think the department will ever agree to a bill," said State Sen. Donald Bishop (R-Rochester), shaking his head.

Bishop, whose district includes the lakes country of western Oakland County, had just come from a hearing, last week, with the Senate conservation committee on his bill to regulate public access sites for boaters on inland lakes.

Bishop says his SB 1343 would "set criteria."

The State Department of Natural Resources says of the local property owners and townships: "They're just trying to keep the public off."

Committee Chairman Joe Mack (D-Ironwood) told Bishop and the DNR to get together and see if they can work out their disagreements.

So far, the only thing they can agree on is that Bishop and other lakes legislators, notably Rep. Rick Fessler (R-Union Lake) have introduced the same bill before.

KEITH WILSON, director of DNR's waterways division, denies there's even a problem with a glut of new access sites. "We haven't bought a parcel of property down there since 1967, and only three after 1949. Our acquisition program poses no threat to riparian owners in that county."

Bishop's bill would limit DNR to acquiring access sites only on lakes of 160 acres or more where less than 75

per cent of the frontage is in residential use.

DNR's Wilson says: "In Oakland County, the only lakes (eligible) would be those with a huge swamp or where we already own property. That takes it out of Oakland County"—that is, no Oakland lakes would meet that criterion.

Bishop wants access sites only where there is a major or secondary road that is not presently overloaded with traffic.

Wilson calls that provision vague. "It doesn't say whether the road must be overloaded all year long or only one day of the year," he said.

WILSON SEES one provision as causing too much delay in site acquisition if the bill is passed. Presently it takes 100 days to go through the legal and Natural Resources Commission procedures to acquire a site. "And that's only if everything goes exactly right."

He says Bishop's bill would add 120 days to the procedure. That adds up to 220 days, or 57 per cent of a year. A seller would be reluctant to grant DNR an option to buy his property if he had to wait 220 days to close the deal, Wilson said.

Bishop's bill would require one foot of access site frontage for every acre of lake. Thus, for a 175-acre lake, the access site would have to have 175 feet of frontage.

"You only need the width of a boat ramp plus 20 feet on either side for frontage," said Wilson. "We try to acquire a minimum of 100 feet."

A KEY RESTRICTION which Wilson says would backfire on the bill's sponsors would require one auto parking space in the access site for every five acres of lake surface.

"On the 175-acre lake we were talking about, this would mean 35 parking spaces. Under our (present) criteria, we would provide only 20 parking units. The sponsors would be run out of

town by their own electorate if this passed," said Wilson.

If some lakes are crowded, it could be because there are too many boats, but it could also be because boats are traveling too fast.

"Speed limits can be placed on a lake. There is a procedure under the Marine Safety Act for doing that," said Wilson.

He added: "The owners say in effect, 'If you don't put in an access site, we don't have a problem.' That's just garbage. They're just trying to keep the public off."

## Energy cost help available

April 30 is the deadline to apply for help in paying utility bills under the Energy Assistance Act.

In January the Michigan Legislature approved the bill, which expires Sept. 30, 1978, and appropriated \$38 million.

Under the bill's provisions, there are two types of payments made to those who qualify.

For persons directly responsible for paying utility bills an initial payment of up to \$130 will be made, depending upon income. A second payment of up to \$70 will be made for those qualified, based on actual gas, oil, and electrical energy usage for November, December and January. The total of the two payments cannot exceed \$200.

Those who received payments under the recently completed Federal Energy Crisis Program will have those dollars used to credit future bills deducted from payments made under the new state Energy Assistance Program. The total for the combined payment from both programs cannot exceed \$200 for heat or \$160 for electricity.

Application forms are being mailed by fuel supplies to area residents. Forms also may be obtained, and questions answered, at the Canton, Northville, Plymouth YMCA, 292 S. Main, Plymouth, located above Fisher Shoe Store.

# Roll Call Report

## Pursell, Ford back House pothole repair bill

Here's how area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes Feb. 16 through Feb. 22.

### HOUSE

**POTHOLES**—Passed, 274 for and 137 against, a bill (HR 10979) to give the states \$250 million for repairing potholes on their roads. The money would be allocated according to such factors as a state's climate, miles of paved roads and the number of vehicle-miles travelled within the state. Each state capable of demonstrating "emergency" conditions, including those with tropical climates, would receive no less than one-half of one per cent of the \$250 million. The bill was sent to the Senate.

Rep. Robert Young (D-Mo.), a supporter, said: "This is a record-setting winter, and I believe that it demands some precedent-setting legislation. The bill... is a one-time emergency measure. It does not imply that the federal government will assist the states in road repair every winter."

Rep. Butler Derrick (D-S.C.), an opponent, said: "The resources of the federal government are not infinite. We simply cannot assume every new responsibility even when it may be a worthy one. The federal government cannot be all things to all people and at the same time maintain a sound budget and a strong national economy."

Members voting "yea" favored the \$300 million appropriation for pothole repairs.

Reps. David Bonior (D-Mt. Clemens), William Ford (D-Taylor), William Brodhead (D-Detroit), James Blanchard (D-Pleasant Ridge), William Broomfield (R-Birm.) and Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), voted "yea."

**HUMPHREY INSTITUTE**—Passed, 356 for and 53 against, a bill (HR 10606) authorizing a once-only expenditure of \$5 million to help establish the proposed Humbert H. Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota. The facility would provide college-level and adult

education instruction in government, and serve as a repository of the public papers of the former senator and vice president. The Senate has not yet acted on the bill.

Rep. Albert Quie (R-Minn.), a supporter, said "the greatest memorial to (Humphrey's) life will be the preparation of future generations of leaders. Let us insure that today."

Rep. Robert Bauman (R-Md.), an opponent, said his opposition "in no way denigrates" Humphrey's public record but expresses his concern that "if we are in fact to spend taxpayers' money in the amount of \$5 million for any one of the many who are prominent, one has to raise the question of exactly where the line is to be drawn."

Members voting "yea" favored the expenditure.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead, Blanchard, Broomfield and Pursell voted "yea."

**B-1 BOMBER**—Voted, 234 for and 182 against, to terminate the B-1 bomber program. This vote rescinded a previous \$462 million appropriation for two more B-1 prototypes, and was regarded as the final congressional action needed to kill the B-1 program in accordance with President Carter's request of last year. The B-1 once was regarded as the "bomber of the future" and four prototypes were built. But Carter and Congress have now decided that B-52s outfitted with Cruise missiles will serve as the next generation of manned bomber.

Rep. Jack Edwards (R-Ala.), a supporter of killing the program, said: "I guess I am looked upon as something of a superhawk. And yet I cannot go along with the construction of (two more B-1 prototypes). For goodness sake, think of the folks back home who are paying the taxes."

Rep. Samuel Stratton (D-N.Y.), an opponent, said: "We Americans prided ourselves on keeping our military technology ahead of that of the Soviet Union. Certainly, in our vital nuclear Triad, we cannot do anything less than use the latest technology, which is, of course, the B-1 bomber."

Members voting "yea" opposed the B-1.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead, Blanchard and Pursell voted "yea." Broomfield voted "nay."

### SENATE

**PANAMA CANAL**—Tabled, 67 for and 30 against, a motion aimed at undercutting Senate support for the proposed Panama Canal treaties. The motion sought to reverse the order by

which the Senate will consider the two treaties, so that the treaty transferring control of the canal zone to Panama would be voted on before the treaty guaranteeing the canal's neutrality. Adoption of this tabling motion means that the neutrality treaty will be brought up first. The order is important because many senators will vote for transfer only if the neutrality treaty is first amended to guarantee U.S. defense interests.

This was the first record vote since

Senate debate on the treaties began Feb. 8. A two-thirds majority—at least 67 votes—is required for ratification.

Sen. Howard Baker (R-Tenn.), a supporter of tabling, said the neutrality treaty must be considered first because "it is only if we pass perfecting amendments to (it) that I could say, in good conscience, that the national security interests of this country are fully protected."

Sen. William Scott (R-Va.), an opponent of tabling, said: "It seems to me

that, first, we ought to decide whether or not there will be a transfer of title and control of the Canal Zone before we consider this question of neutrality. It just is not logical to consider it any other way."

Senators voting "nay" were opponents of the treaties who wanted to change order of consideration in hopes of blocking ratification.

Sen. Donald Riegle (D) voted "yea." Sen. Robert Griffin (R) voted "nay."

## Reuther Center may close doors to the aged soon

A new method of financing the Reuther Extended Care facility in Westland must be discovered by March 15 or the center may close its doors to its 178 patients.

That's the deadline set by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners at a recent meeting.

After approving a \$545,820 supplemental appropriation to keep the facility operating through March 12, the commissioners adopted an amendment setting March 15 as the deadline for finding state or federal funds to keep the facility open and "self-supporting."

If the deadline passes without success in finding financing, the board is expected to propose a phase-out plan, which would have to be approved by federal district court Judge Ralph Freeman.

In response to lawsuits filed to stop the closing of the Reuther facility, the courts have ruled that the county has the right to close it. But Freeman also has said the county must have an "orderly transition" plan.

If Reuther hospital closes, its patients would be transferred to some of the 110 licensed nursing homes in Wayne County. About 15,000 patients

now are housed in those nursing facilities.

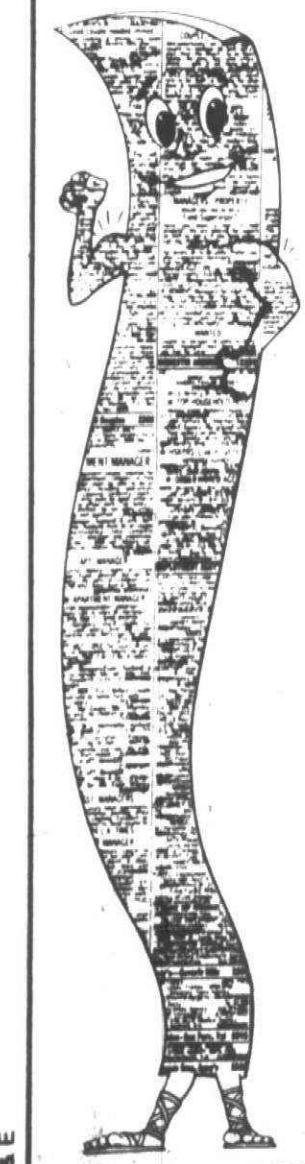
Faced with a \$13 million deficit, the county board of commissioners adopted the recommendation of the board of auditors that the Reuther facility be closed due to the county's \$3.5 million annual operating deficit.

"The future of the Reuther facility is in the hands of the state and federal authorities," John Barr, chairman of the Board of Commissioners, said. "The county cannot afford to subsidize the facility when we are mandated by law to pay for skyrocketing criminal justice needs."

"If the Medicaid payments could be raised to reflect the unique and higher level of skilled nursing care offered at the Reuther center, it could be self-supporting and there would be no reason to close it. Nearly 85 per cent of the patients are Medicare recipients," he said.

Barr said Medicaid reimburses the county \$60 per day for a Medicaid patient compared with an actual cost of \$108 per day. There is some doubt, however, that the Department of Social Services could increase payments to the Reuther facility without increasing payments to other nursing facilities as well.

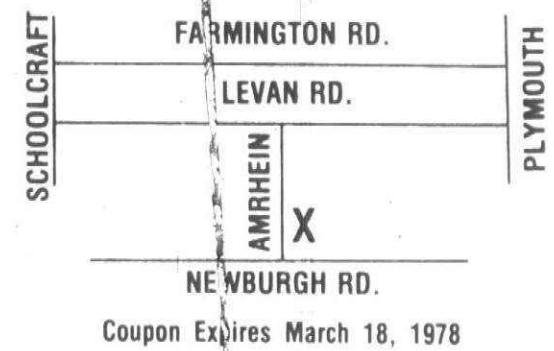

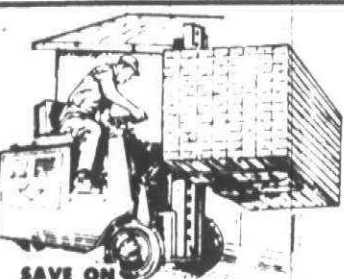

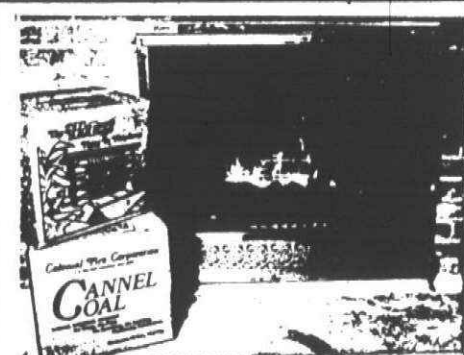

### Don't miss chance to appeal tax bill

Who'd have thought that Canton Township taxpayers would miss an opportunity to gripe about their tax bills?

Supervisor Harold Stein's secretary, Rose Bretzlaff, said last week that the number of persons requesting an appeal before the tax board of review has been surprisingly low. So, in a rare plea for complaints, Mrs. Bretzlaff is extending the deadline to allow anyone the opportunity to meet with the tax board of review now through March 17.

Call the Canton Township Hall at 397-2777, to reserve an appointment to make your plea.

The board of review is composed of three residents—Richard Palmer, Jack Blumenshine and Jerry Williams—who are local taxpayers themselves who can respond to valid complaints by reducing property assessments.

But to get your assessment lowered, you must have a better reason than just believing that taxes are too high. Normally, assessments are hiked every year by the application of an "equalization factor," which is governed by inflation. You can find out what your new property assessment is by calling the Canton treasurer's office.

As most taxpayers know, all local millage rates (school, township, county) are levied against the state equalized valuation (SEV) of property.

The SEV is supposed to represent 50 per cent of the market value of the property. The equalization factor then is applied to bring local assessments up to state equalized values when the state decides that the local assessments are too low.

Thus, a local assessment of \$10,000 would be multiplied by a factor of 1.15 if the state thought local assessments were 15 per cent too low.

In the example above, it would simply be a matter of determining whether \$11,500 is half of a what a homeowner's property is worth. If a person thinks the home is worth more, he has no complaint. But if he thinks his property is worth less, he should take his complaint to the board of review and appeal for a reduction. Good luck.

### Bravo for business

Supervisor Harold Stein could still stand a refresher course in Norman Vincent Peale's "How to Win Friends and Influence People," but he's been making liars out of people who pooh-poohed his plans to bring industrial development to Canton.

His justifiable concern is that Canton could fall into the trap that besets so many other suburban communities—lack of a diversified tax base.

Maybe he's going in the office at 7 a.m. to work, not just to impress his co-workers. Because there's an impressive application to build a food distribution center in the works, and a fabricating company is taking advantage of plant rehabilitation funds.

He has taken steps to improve water pressure in the industrial corridor along Michigan Avenue to attract large industry in the southern end of the township.

Stein is out there stumping for business in a way we can support. Not by bending over to give them breaks, but by making business contribute to the good of the whole community.

### Advantages of gray

One shouldn't have to remind folks to do something that is to their advantage. It should be self-evident, for example, that it's good business to hire older workers. The state really shouldn't have to observe Employ the Older Worker Week March 12-18 and put on a campaign to help persons over 45 find jobs.

Maybe it's necessary, though, because we forget a few things.

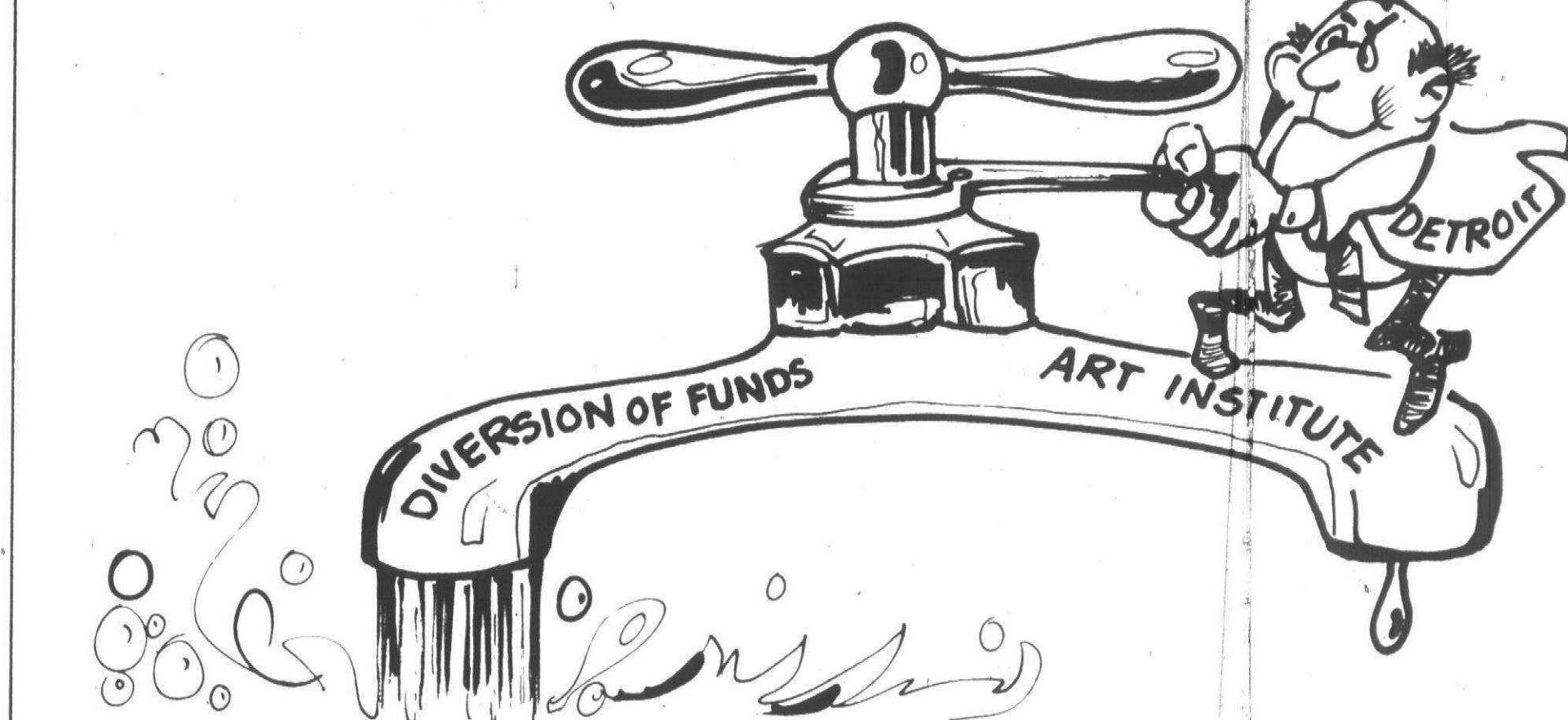
One is that fewer persons will be entering the work force in the next three years. The post-World War II baby boom persons are already in the work force. There should be reduced pressure to force workers to retire at 65.

Second thing is that our Social Security system is under financial pressure. Eliminating mandatory retirement will help build up the fund and stop the drain.

A third thing is that older workers tend to be the most skilled workers. They tend to take less sick leave and have fewer job turnovers and job-related accidents than younger workers, according to the Michigan Employment Security Commission.

Mandatory retirement of older workers takes the life out of many of them. That's a charitable reason for not forcing older workers to retire. But there are more practical, solid, business reasons for keeping "gray power" on the payroll.

## Detroit skims aid to art institute

The truth about the Detroit aid package is starting to come out.

Just six weeks after Gov. William G. Milliken announced his budget would boost aid to the Detroit Institute of Arts by 60 per cent (to \$7.1 million), there appeared a fly in the ointment.

Detroit Budget Director Walter Stecher proposed that the art institute reimburse \$250,000 toward the city's overall power bill.

Art Institute Director Frederick Cummings is denouncing the budget machination as a "step backwards." He said it will disrupt the art institute's ambitious program, perhaps forcing it to shelve one or more major exhibitions such as "Peru's Golden Treasures."

So you now get the scenario: Detroit has a cultural institution it can't support; the state deems the art institute to have statewide cultural significance; the state kicks in two-thirds of the operating budget; and the city creams off some of that aid for other purposes.

THE ART INSTITUTE isn't the only institution in line for state aid.

The Milliken budget asks \$6.5 million for the Detroit Public Library and \$742,000 for the Detroit Historical Museum.

For several years, the state has been pumping more than \$9 million annually into the Detroit Department of Transportation to subsidize pension liabilities of the city's bus system.

Floating around the legislature is an "urban grants" program designed to help cities that levy income taxes. Few cities do so, and only Detroit has a two per cent tax rate (the others charge one per cent), so Detroit will come up with \$8 million of the \$12 million in that kitty.

Then we stumble across this gem in the bottom of a long, gray article in the daily papers: "Detroit's school system would gain an additional \$3 million in municipal overburden funds (this year) because of changes in the funding formula providing reimbursement to cities that levy utility taxes."

I'll give you one guess how many, and which, cities tax utilities. Just one guess.

One. Detroit alone has power to tax utilities and collect a \$3 million state reward. . . But I digress.

THIS IS NOT to argue that the Detroit Institute

of Arts isn't a cultural asset for all of southeast Michigan, or even for the state.

Rather, the argument is that it's foolish for the state to fund a city institution without acquiring some control over that institution.

The Detroit Institute of Arts is owned and operated by the City of Detroit. Theoretically, we smart-aleck suburbanites shouldn't have anything to say about how Detroit runs its affairs. But we're paying for it.

Well, you say, it's only \$250,000 out of a budget of \$10.6 million. Ah, but the city financial experts have other siphons in mind. Budget Director Stecher is quoted as saying there are plans to charge the art institute for water and sewer services next year.

Npw, the rest of us, as customers of Detroit's water and sewer department, have found out how futile it is to challenge what Detroit wants to charge us for water and sewer services. It took a federal court case just to get an outside audit of that department.

So who is there to protest if the City of Detroit wants to charge sky-high water rates to the Institute of Arts? No one, really, has the freedom to do it because the art institute is controlled by the City of Detroit.

And the rest of the state pays for it, or at least \$7.1 million out of a \$10.6 million budget.

The truth about the Detroit aid package is starting to come out.

## Old 'protection' law stifles banking

Banking is one of the most regulated industries in our country. Banks are watched over by the Federal Reserve Boards, the comptroller of the currency, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. and the state financial institutions department, among others.

The general purpose of all the regulations is to protect the consumer's money.

However, there is always the problem that if there is too much regulation, instead of protecting the consumer, there becomes a restriction of competition among banks, and the consumer is, in fact, hurt rather than protected.

In the 1930s, banks closed. In the 1940s, there were banking scandals in Michigan. As a result, under the banner of protection, strict banking laws were passed in this state.

Under the state constitution, all banking legislation requires a two-thirds vote of the legislature instead of the simple majority vote for other bills. This makes new laws harder to pass, entrenches old laws that may not be appropriate today, and helps stifle innovation.

ONE OF THE LAWS passed in the 1940s, as a result of the banking scandals, was the branch banking law. It said no bank could put a branch more than 25 miles away from its home office.

It also said no bank could put a branch in a city where another bank or another bank's branch was already located.

This latter portion of the law assured a virtual monopoly once a bank was in a city unless people wanted to start a brand new bank.

The whole 25-mile limitation is inappropriate today because the suburbs have grown substantially beyond the 25-mile parameter. The outer edges of suburbs are limited to new banks.

The backers of the branch banking law back in the '40s were the large Detroit banks. The law allowed them to surround the largest metropolitan area in the state, branch into the best communities and keep out competition.

The problem was that the consumer was forgotten. Everyone got the same service, which was little. Savings accounts were paid 1.5 per cent interest. No business was conducted on Saturdays. Local loans of a substantial size had to be sent downtown for review.

THE STODDARD family of Michigan National Bank figured out a way to get around the old law.

They started several new banks such as the Troy National Bank, Oakland National Bank in Southfield, Livonia National Bank and several others.

This allowed them to move into cities that were previously monopolized by one bank.

When the new banks were formed, all of a sudden savings account interest soared, Saturday banking reappeared, no service charge banking was innovated, and banks began to compete by offering more services.

Then under the new Bank Holding Company Act, Michigan National put the ownership under one umbrella, the Michigan National Corp., and changed all the banks' names to Michigan National Bank—something.

They allowed customers to deposit funds to, or withdraw funds from their accounts at any location,

"How had those students weathered the proximity of older students? Could they recall any bad experiences?

"People like U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell and Russell Kirk, author, syndicated columnist and arch conservative, were two of the underprivileged who were not available for questioning. Golf pro Tyler Caplin was not contacted in California nor was Kenny Fisher, director of the Post-Education Convening Authority of the Institute for Educational Leadership in Washington.

"They seemed to have overcome the ill effects of spending their middle school years next door to the older students.

"Those interviewed have stayed in their hometown area..." (Column continues with experiences of those who found the experience beneficial).

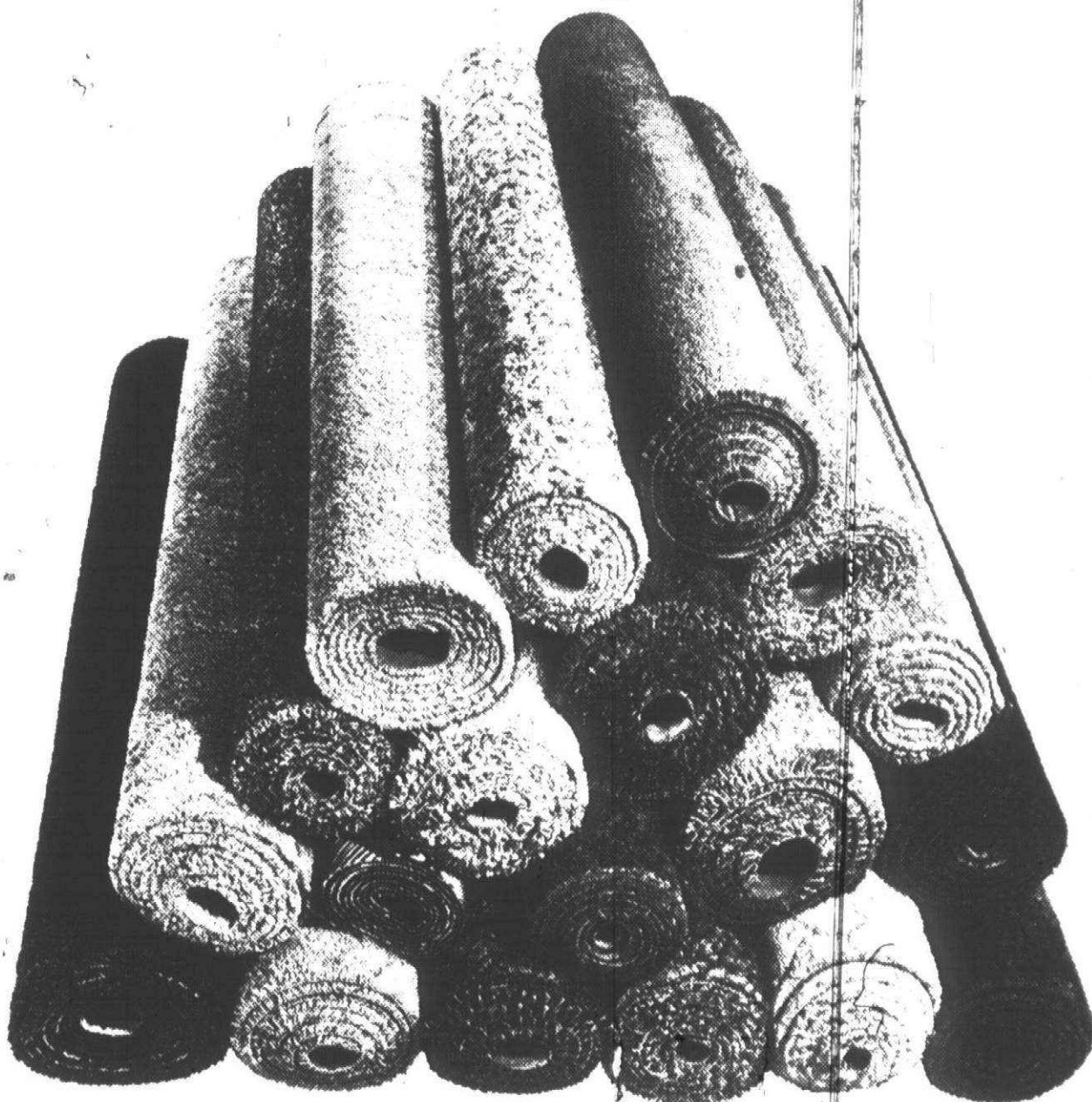

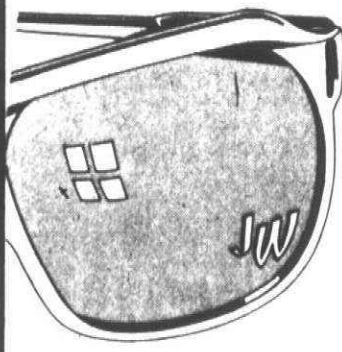

### Managers, as group, happier than blue collar work force

The current crop of management literature is loaded with books and articles which seem to suggest that today's managers are overworked, overcommitted to their career roles and emotionally undernourished in terms of job satisfaction.

You might even assume that anyone in a supervisory or executive position, if given the choice, would opt for the simple life of the clerk or factory hand and give back his/her trappings of office, status, salaries, fringe benefits, etc. But the truth seems to be opposite.

Recent surveys conducted by the Institute for Social Research at the University of Michigan suggest that managers, as a group, are happier and more contented with their lives, families and jobs than are blue-collar and non-management white-collar workers.

Even the long-term trend is optimistic. Managers today feel no more frustrated than their counterparts of 20 years ago. But they may be operating at a higher need level of satisfaction than their predecessors because their basic human needs (food, shelter, clothing) are better satisfied today.

The fundamental differences between the managers of old and the new breed are differences in style and value priorities. The typical manager

of the '20s and '30s tended to be more authoritarian while today's manager tends to be more democratic or participative in style.

Value priority differences involve a movement or direction away from materialistic values (sustenance and safety needs) to the non-material needs like self-esteem, belonging, creativity and self-realization, i.e. quality of work, good interpersonal relationships and involvement in decisions.

The most interesting implication of the above study is that the new direction in style and values of managers runs parallel to the style and value preferences of most recent college graduates.

# Winkler's technique is there

The smallest and one of the least enthusiastic audiences of the year heard one of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra's best concerts of the season Sunday.

While the 32d season hasn't been one of Plymouth's best performance years, guest conductor Clark E. Suttle and the group called up a lot of adrenal for the works of Debussy, Wieniawski and Mendelssohn.

THE JOYOUS number was Wieniawski's Violin Concerto No. 2 with the feline Kathleen Winkler as soloist. Miss Winkler crouches and springs on the more tortuous passages. She soars gracefully with the frequent lyrical passages.

In the final movement, marked in the style of the Gypsy, she flicks her hand up the fingerboard to make the high notes zing.

Miss Winkler's tone isn't opulent—though perhaps I have been a little spoiled by the 10-inch recording young Isaac Stern made back in the Pleistocene Era. But her phrasing is exactly right, and with a composer as warmly Romantic as Wieniawski, phrasing is critical.

All the required technique is there, too, for Wieniawski himself was one of the giant performers of his day and required technique in his compositions.

## Review

On balance, it was an entirely satisfying performance of a concerto that has long been missing from the national repertoire and was performed for only the first time in Plymouth. It's full of melody, full of bravura and full of violinistic razzle-dazzle.

Miss Winkler, who at 27 is cracking out of the teaching and orchestral mold, will be a soloist on part of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's statewide tour this spring. It's likely out-state audiences won't take her for granted.

The only sour sound was the program notes of William Weichlein, who huffily dismisses Wieniawski's short works as "generally well-written, often brilliant and ineffective, but of no particular importance as significant compositions." Musicologists are often piano snobs.

AFTER A SHAKY performance of Beethoven's Symphony No. 7 in November and a January family cert that is better forgotten, the orchestra is getting back into the woodwind section; there were brief solo

in the concerto that were little short of perfection.

The big problem has been the violin sections, and young Suttle has been working them hard and giving them lots of attention. A few entrances are still rickety. And there was a passage between the first and second movements of the concerto that was embarrassingly tinny.

But Suttle has been making great progress in his brief stint with the orchestra while Musical Director Wayne Dunlap is on sabbatical. Suttle conducted two Debussy nocturnes and

the Mendelssohn "Reformation" symphony without the scores, and it left him free to concentrate on giving precise directions.

A good technician, Suttle is learning how to get subtle shadings of tone from his troops. His handling of the Mendelssohn symphony gave this quasi-religious work a clear, bright tone that was different and a delight.

The former Livonian earned his spurs as a string bass player, even soloing with the Plymouth orchestra a few years back. He can pick his specialty and be a success either way.

# Madonna spring registration set

Registration will be held at Madonna College, Livonia, March 13 through 18 for new courses and workshops offered in the spring-summer term. Some classes in this term begin May 2 and extend to July 25, while others begin in mid-June and meet for shorter blocks of time or on weekends. Many are scheduled for evenings.

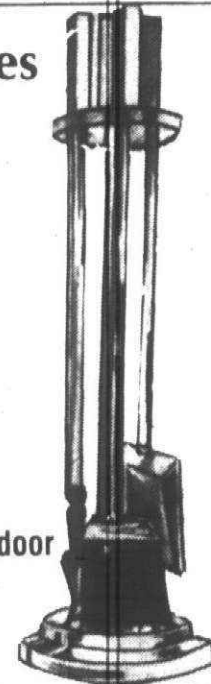

of Paul Revere," Trumbull's "The Battle of Bunker Hill," and others will be priced at \$15 or \$25.

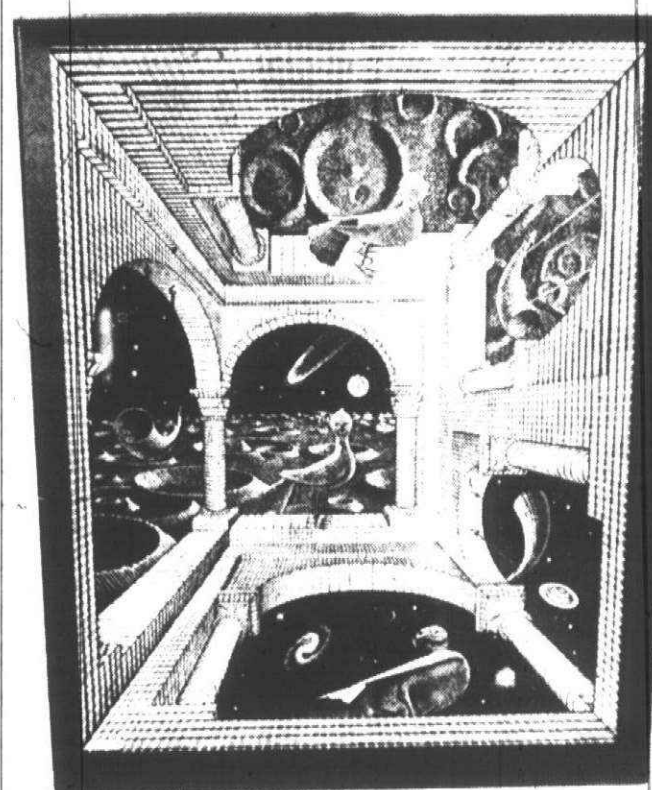
A few of the works included in the sale will be on display in the window of the Detroit Edison office on Main Street until March 14.

Clara Camp chairs the rental gallery committee. The current inventory of 139 pieces includes 65 reproductions and 74 originals.



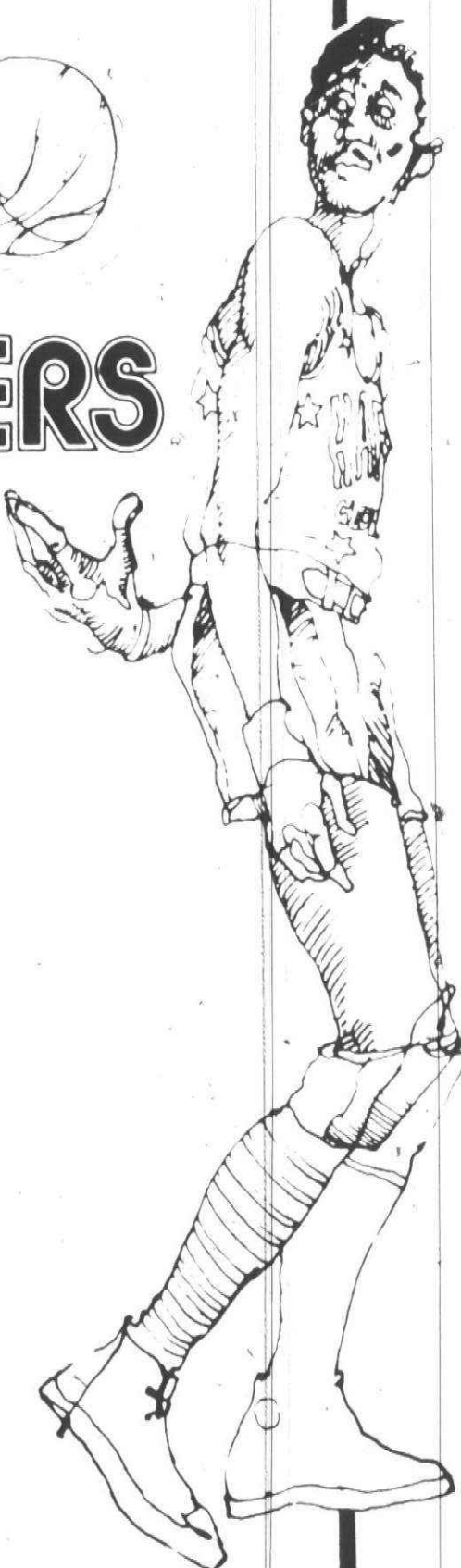
A reproduction of M.C. Escher's "Another World" (left) and a batik original by Kay Leman will be offered for sale March 15.

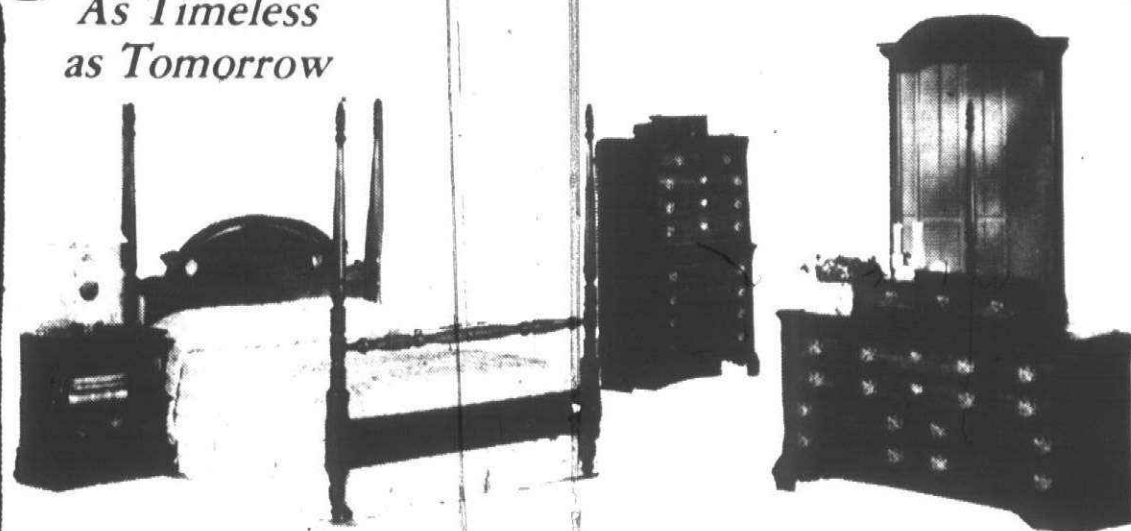

# Lutheran reports on Africa

David Mesenbring is experiencing a sense of relief now that he is home in Farmington, after a two-year stay in South Africa.

But he also has a feeling of pain. "It is painful when friends of yours are picked up at 3 a.m. and detained by the government," he said. "So while it is a relief to get away from that kind of atmosphere, there is also the pain of leaving the people I was close to."

"I don't know which is worse, to get a phone call with the news of an arrest, or not hearing about it at all." Mesenbring, who was in South Africa during a wave of oppression against blacks last fall, soon will talk on his experiences in two area churches. He also will discuss the role in African politics of his friend Steve Biko, who died in jail last September, and who many believe was murdered.

At 7 p.m. Sunday, Mesenbring will speak in Faith Lutheran Church, 30000 Five Mile, Livonia. At 10:15 a.m., March 19, he will relate his story in Hope Lutheran Church in Farmington, where his father, the Rev. Victor Mesenbring is pastor. The church is at 26715 Farmington Road, Farmington.

Mesenbring himself has a master's degree in theology from the University of Chicago, and found that working with South African religious groups was a good way to meet people in that troubled country.

"THERE WERE TWO MAJOR groups of Christians," he said. "There were the historical churches like the Anglican, Methodist and Catholic, and the African Independent Church. I tried to work in both."

"But I was disillusioned with the historical religions. I felt the grass roots

Christians were in the independent churches. They took the traditional African culture and Christianized it in an authentic African way."

"In the west we have developed God's word, and we're weak in the spirit. In the independent churches I met people who had a profound understanding of God's spirit."

"I was not a teacher, but I could share with them what I knew about the word, and they offered me what they knew about the spirit."

MESENBRING MET STEVE BIKO through a mutual friend.

"My friend told me Biko and I would like each other," recalled the former North Farmington High School student. "Biko was one of the most unracist individuals I've encountered. He didn't see me as a white man, but judged me on my own terms."

After the young black leader's death, Mesenbring was involved with helping collect papers about Biko, as well as Biko's own writings to be used in a soon-to-be-published biography.

"A man who was kicked out of the country asked me to do this for him," said Mesenbring. "So, I talked to groups who had the material he needed. I have to be vague about this because some of those who gave me information could get in trouble."

Biko's main contribution to blacks living in South Africa was to start a black consciousness movement. It was not a political movement but one designed to instill a mood, and to overcome black inferiority, Mesenbring pointed out.

"A number of different organizations sprang from it, such as medical clinics run by blacks, cottage industries and other programs to meet blacks' needs."

"No question that Biko was the

genius behind it. He felt that even if the government cracked down on black organizations, black consciousness would continue."

Mesenbring then noted that last October, 17 black organizations were banned. But six weeks later, three new ones had already taken their place.

MESENBRING WENT TO South Africa to teach at St. Bede Anglican Seminary, but he purposefully found a variety of jobs. He thought different kinds of employment would take him into interesting corners of the country.

While writing a correspondence course on South African church history, he made his home in a rural area where he learned to speak Xhosa. Often called the click language, Xhosa uses three different click sounds in place of the letters C, Q and K.

"Learning the language is the only way to make contact with people," he

said. "You can't understand their way of life unless you talk to them."

"With rural people I got the sense that they still had their sense of dignity, that they believe in their own way of life. Urban blacks have been broken down by being inundated by white values."

He also traveled to various areas with a religious education extension course.

In his second year, he lived in the home of a prominent Afrikaner journalist, a descendant of early Dutch settlers. Afrikaners, he says, basically run the country.

"The Afrikaners were persecuted by the English back in the days of the Boer War, and it resulted in a build up in their national spirit," said Mesenbring. "Yet they don't seem to understand that their persecution of the blacks is building in the blacks that same kind of spirit."

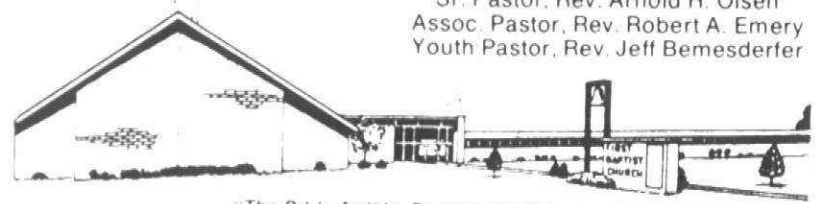

# How Oakway found itself a 4-piano concerto

The premier American performance of a four-piano concerto is a tale that begins in a discount department store in the suburbs, goes twice to England and will end next week in Birmingham.

The work is "Variations on a Theme by Mozart" by the contemporary Englishman George Malcolm.

It will be performed at 4 p.m. Sunday, March 19 in Seaholm High School, W. Lincoln at Cranbrook, by members of the Birmingham Musicales and the Oakway Symphony Orchestra.

The tale began when Oakway Conductor Francesco DiBlasi, on a shopping trip in Korvette's, stumbled across an obscure London disc called "Music for Four Harpsichords." Most of the music is from the 18th century, but the Mozart variations were written by Malcolm, one of the performers.

DiBlasi liked it and sought the score in order to perform it. It turned out to be unpublished.

An Oakway board member tried to track down Malcolm on a trip to England and couldn't locate him.

Then Michael Rasmussen, choir director of Antioch Lutheran Church in Farmington Hills, visited a friend who plays in the London Philharmonic and came up with Malcolm's address.

"I sent him a money order for \$20," DiBlasi recalls, "and wrote out my credentials and asked for a copy of the score, expecting a Xerox copy."

"By return mail, I got George Malcolm's own original, pencil score and his handwritten notes on how to perform it—four pages!"

DiBlasi wrote his own orchestral

accompaniment to the work, turning it in effect into a concerto.

The trusting Malcolm turned out to be a pianist and conductor of some note who has performed in his own land, Canada, the United States, the Philippines, Japan and Israel. A Mozart specialist, Malcolm in recent years has concentrated on the harpsichord, a keyboard instrument in which the strings are mechanically plucked rather than hammered, as with the piano.

Malcolm performed in a harpsichord

recital early last year in New York.

THE THEME is taken from the andante gracioso movement of Mozart's Duo for Violin and Viola (K. 424). The variations are true to the classical grace of the original theme.

•Marian Siatczynski, Bloomfield Hills mother of six and student of the piano.

# Mackenzie ousts Bishop Borgess

A hot-shooting Detroit Mackenzie quintet that canned 57 per cent of its field-goal attempts and 20 of 25 from the free-throw line eliminated Redford Bishop Borgess from the Livonia Franklin Class A basketball regional Tuesday, 62-50.

Borgess never led in the contest, as Mackenzie scored its first basket only six seconds after the opening tip-off and out-pointed the Spartans during every quarter.

Keith Smith, a 5-11 all-PSL guard for the Stags, failed to net any points during the first eight minutes, but had collected 20 by the end of the contest.

The Stags led 16-11 after the first period. The Spartans, trailing by as many as nine points at one point of the second quarter, came back to within three, 26-23. But two turnovers, a missed one-and-one opportunity and a

foul sent Mackenzie into the locker-room at the intermission up 30-23.

Dave Agardy scored Borgess' first three field goals of the third quarter, as the Spartans again pulled to within three, 32-29, but a three-point play by Smith shortly thereafter built a more secure Mackenzie advantage.

Borgess, which committed 21 turnovers during the contest, started throwing the ball around regularly in the third period and began fouling in an effort to catch up. Mackenzie was in the bonus situation five-and-a-half minutes into the third period.

The Stags canned 14 of 17 from the charity stripe during the second half.

The Spartans committed three consecutive turnovers late in the third period to enable Mackenzie to increase its lead to 47-37 going into the fourth. The Stags notched five unanswered

points in less than a minute at the start of the final quarter to put the game out of reach.

Borgess coach Ron Gutkowski suggested that his Spartans may have been a little drained by their tough Ferndale District.

"I didn't think we had much intensity. We had three games last week and it's really an experience for us to beat Ferndale," said Gutkowski. "We just didn't come back with the same effort tonight."

"We just weren't aggressive attacking their defense (mostly zone, with occasional pressing). It was not necessarily their good defense, but rather our inept offensive play," Gutkowski said.

"I thought we could go inside, but we turned the ball over before we got there."

Dave Agardy tossed in 16 points for the Spartans, Dave Decoster 15 and Dan Decoster 11.

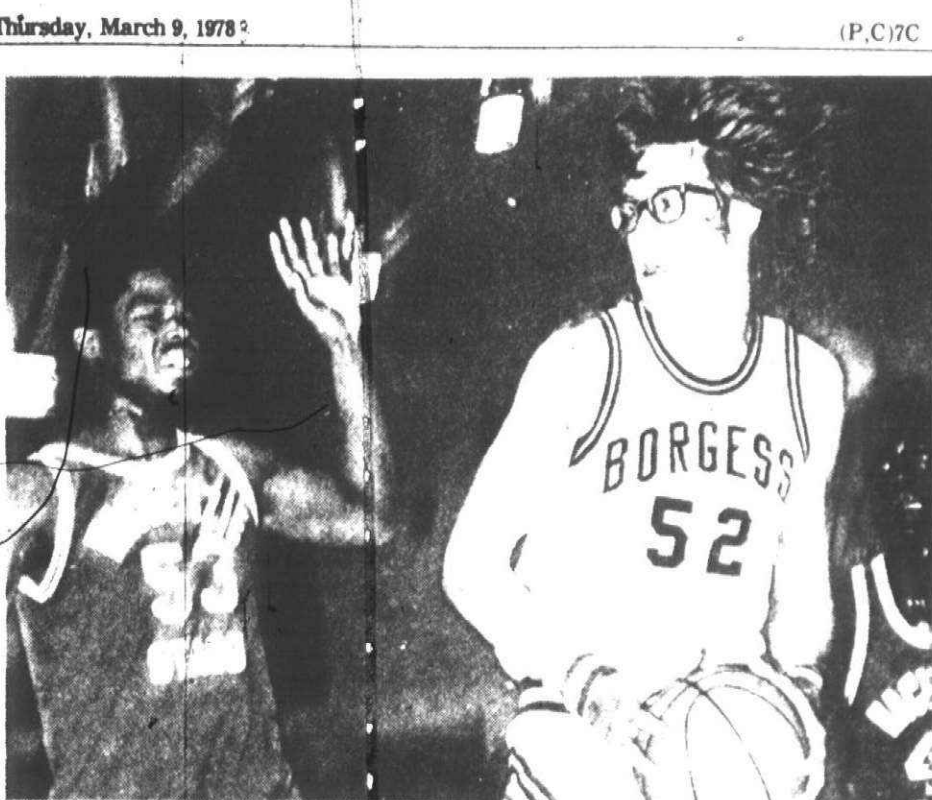

## Campers show sense

The recent camper and RV show at the W. Eight Mile Armory showed the industry is finally coming to its environmental senses.

For years, we watched campers and RVs repeat the errors of the automobile industry in the 1950s and '60s—bigger and bigger, more and more elaborate, higher and higher pricetags. The trend in the auto industry was reversed by the energy crisis that began in 1974.

But the camper and RV people didn't catch on until this year.

Most pop-up campers have been in the 1,400 pound and up class. The 1978 show came up with a couple of models which could be pulled by compact and sub-compact autos at great gasoline savings.

One nifty little model tips the scales at less than 800 pounds. It stands 40 inches high, which means that you can see over the top in your rear-view mirror.

The only bad note was a continuation of the trend to sell lots of options on campers and cheat on some of the basics. Last year I was annoyed to find beds of 44- and 46-inch widths being touted as capable of sleeping two persons. Standard is 52 inches.

This year, I found a 42-inch-wide bed touted as a double.

Such a bed could handle two 3-year-olds, but not two adults, not even if they cuddle. Take a tape measure along when you shop.

CAMPING FEES are up this year in Michigan state parks. The new schedule:

- \$5 a night per site in all campgrounds with modern facilities, including electrical service, whether or not you use the electricity.
- \$4 a night at sites with either flush toilets and no electricity, or vault toilets and electricity.

•12 a night where there are no modern facilities and in areas used by backpackers.

•\$10 a night for trailside cabins in the Porcupine Mountains and Wilderness state parks.

•\$15 a day for frontier cabins.

•\$2 per six persons a night for "organization" camping such as scout or church groups.

ALMOST HALF of all Americans hunted, fished or took part in some wildlife-related recreation as of 1975, according to the U.S. Interior Department.

The every-five-years survey found 96 million Americans age 9 and older were active outdoors.

This included 20.6 million hunters, 53.9 million anglers and more than 49 million who observed wildlife.

The last category is new. The environmental movement has brought forth many outdoors lovers who aren't hunters or anglers.

The estimates were based on telephone interviews with 106,000 households in 50 states, and detailed questionnaires were completed by more than 20,000 persons.

Hunters numbered 11 per cent of the population (down from 12 in the 1970 survey). Anglers remained constant at 29 per cent.

Hunters spent \$5.8 billion angling \$15.2 billion to pursue their interests.

The most significant change was a threefold increase in the number of persons who photograph wildlife—from five million in 1970 to 15 million in '75.

## Creative Kitchen Facelifts In Just One Fun Weekend


Who says you have to get out of the kitchen if you can't stand the clutter? Take a weekend and create a hearth your family and friends will love to live in. All it takes is imagination, careful organization, some up-to-date tricks and tools of the trade. Here's how.

**Decorating with Aerosols**  
Start with your walls. First, get rid of tough grease and dirt spots with an aerosol spray cleaner. A fresh coat of color and the drabest kitchen picks up instant pizzazz! A sunny yellow brings a slice of sunshine inside; dark backgrounds let your pots, pans and knick-knacks claim center stage. Wall graphics, ranging from simple color bands and squares to fanciful Peter Max rainbows, can create a unique environment or visually correct a defect in the shape of your kitchen. Block out your design, outline it with masking tape on the wall and paint. If your walls cry for a plastering, try hanging fabric instead. For quick cleaning later, apply an aerosol waterproofing or plastic laminate spray on the fabric. Use an aerosol spray glue on those leftover remnants to give new life to your canisters and cookbooks.

**Transform with Trimmings**  
Now, turn your attention to the

all-important trimmings. Windows, for example, should reveal the vision you'd like. If it's and indoor garden, why not showcase your plants hanging at different levels from the rim of an old basketball hoop attached to the top of the window. Spray paint the hoop for a brand-new brilliance. If you like the view, frame it with shutters or 2 by 4's, spray painted or covered with fabric. Old cabinets and refrigerators can be revitalized with stencil designs, bought at hardware stores or homemade from stiff board or cloth. Tape them down firmly. Use an aerosol spray paint in a coordinating color. Be sure to follow directions on the label.

**Final Touches with Flair**  
Highlight your decoration with personal touches. Decoupage—made easy and unmessy with spray glue—transforms old wedding gifts and hand-me-downs into objects d'art. Involve the whole family in your search for the perfect cutouts and labels. Old ticket stubs, invitations and photographs can become a collage wall hanging. Discarded juice, soup and coffee cans create an unusual, kitchen utensil organizer when glued together, spray painted in a bright, shiny enamel and hung on the walls.

## Home Canning is Way to Enjoy Seasonal Eating

There's nothing quite so satisfying as enjoying fruits and vegetables from your own private stock of canned foods and preserves. And, if you've grown your own, as so many people are doing in these inflationary times, canning and preserving can be particularly economical.

However, beginning home canners should be careful to use the proper equipment and follow proper procedures—carelessness can result in spoilage or even death.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture warns that pressure canners should be used for meat, poultry and all vegetables except tomatoes. The reason for this admonition is that such foods are low in acid and need the high temperatures of pressure canning to kill deadly botulism germs and organisms that spoil foods.

Experts also warn that cutting the processing time can result in damage; so can makeshift supplies. Fluctuating heat is another pitfall to avoid, according to experts; heat should be kept steady during processing.

When selecting produce for

canning, make sure that fruits are fresh and firm and that vegetables are young and tender. (In the case of tomatoes, do not use overripe ones, as tomatoes lose acidity as they mature.) Be sure to wash produce thoroughly as dirt contains some of the most deadly bacteria.

You can readily obtain canning supplies in most supermarkets and discount stores. Canning doesn't require a great deal of equipment, but it is essential to have the proper items on hand.

The procedure is not complicated, consisting simply in heating fruits and vegetables hot enough to destroy spoilage organisms. The U.S. Department of Agriculture offers a complete guide, "Home Canning of Fruits and Vegetables", which is available for 45 cents from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.



# helpful hints for gourmets & beginning cooks

Basil is great in tomato juice cocktails, egg dishes, cheese souffles and omelets, Italian dishes, most tomato dishes, roasted poultry and most meats.

Bay should be used sparingly with smoked fish, fish chowders and shrimp, with corned beef, spaghetti, pot roasts and stews. Try dill in fish sauces and cream sauces, with broiled chops and steaks, in tossed green salads, with fish soups and chowders and some vegetables.

Marjoram adds a delightful flavor to stuffed or sauteed mushrooms, creamed fish dishes, rabbit and game birds, tossed green salads and cooked vegetables.

Use mint for a refreshing accent in hot or cold fruit and wine beverages, lamb and veal, fruit salads and some vegetables.

Oregano tastes great in pizza and mushroom dishes, in Spanish and sauces for eggs, vegetables and fish, in spaghetti sauces, meat marinades, with game birds, and in mushroom, vegetable and lentil soups.

Parsley makes a great garnish for canapés, egg dishes, court bouillon, braised dishes and stews, practically all soups and vegetables.

Try rosemary in jams and jellies, fruit cocktails, with most meats, chicken dishes, minestrone soup, in cabbage, broccoli and brussels sprouts.

Sage tastes great in cheese spreads, souffles and sauces, in poultry and vegetable stuffings and in sausage, pork, veal and lamb.

Savory adds flavor to tomato juice cocktails, egg dishes, cheese souffles, fish chowders and stuffings, poultry and poultry stuffings, sweetbreads, pork and veal, soups and certain vegetables.

Tarragon should be used lightly in tomato juice and fish cocktails, egg dishes, fish and shellfish dishes, veal and rabbit, poultry, in vinegar, chicken and fish soups and in Hollandaise sauce.

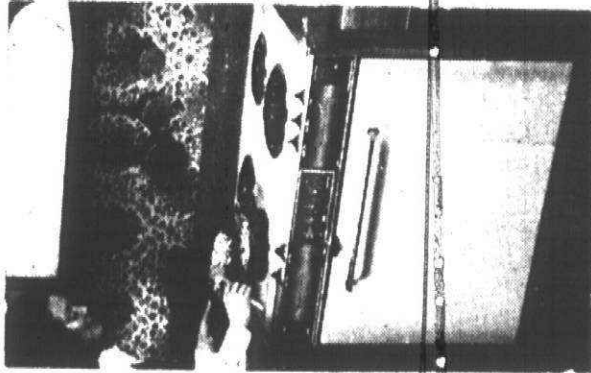
Thyme can blend with strong cheeses, scrambled eggs, fish soups, meats, poultry and many vegetables.

Most of the herbs listed above are great in herb butters, which add wonderful flavorings to meat, vegetables and eggs. The butters are easy to make. Just combine one stick of softened butter (1/4 lb.) with one tablespoon of fresh minced herb (or one teaspoon of dried herb) and one teaspoon of lemon juice, and you have a great taste treat!

Experienced cooks claim that once you try fresh herbs in your foods, you'll never want to use anything else. Many of the common herbs listed here are easy to grow on a windowsill in your apartment or home.

Surfaces to which a plastic laminate will be bonded should be clean, dry and free of oil, paint, varnishes, other finishes—or old cement, if re-laminating. Fill any voids with wood filler and sand smooth. Cut laminate with a 1/4" overlap around all edges so you will have some "play" and won't have to worry about absolutely perfect alignment. (You can file down the edges later.)

After bonding, trim down the overlapping edges, starting with a plane or rasp-like woodworking tool and finishing with a fine-tooth file—using smooth, downward motions. Then smooth the filed edges with a fine-grit sandpaper.

If you're finishing off the edges of the counter or table top with "bands" of laminate, do it before the surface laminate is applied. Cut the banding strip to allow for 1/4" overlap at all edges. If the strip has been cut perfectly straight, bond it flush with the top surface; if not, position it with excess on each side and dress down both sides with a fine file.

## Cooking with Herbs can be Adventure

Parsley, sage, rosemary and thyme... if you think they're only the stuff that songs are made of, you're wrong. Try some of these fragrant herbs in your favorite dishes and drinks and you'll be surprised at the wonderfully subtle flavor they add.

After you try these, you might want to go on to other herbs like basil, dill, marjoram, mint, oregano, savory, or tarragon.

Popular usage has lumped all these ingredients under the category of spices, but many cooks still differentiate herbs from other food accents by defining herbs as leafy aromatic plants grown primarily in the temperate zone.

Cooking with herbs can be great fun, and you should feel free to experiment with them to create your own unique combinations. However, a few basic guidelines may help you avoid common pitfalls.

Generally, you should start with about 1/4 teaspoon of a dried herb to your favorite six-portion recipe. Stir in the herb, taste your dish, add more to suit your taste. Don't

overdo it; adding too much of one kind of herb or combining too many herbs can kill a dish. A little usually goes a long way.

Most herbs, except bay leaves, should be added during the last 10 minutes of cooking to obtain the freshest flavor. Too much cooking dissipates them.

Generally speaking, it's not good practice to repeat a herb you're already using in a dish when you choose herbs for the rest of the menu, like soups or salads.

Most herbs have a lifespan of a year. Old herbs are useless; often they add a bitter taste to a dish. Go through your spice shelves and get rid of any herbs that have lost their color and aroma. It's a good idea to date herbs so you know their age exactly.

Store your herbs in tightly sealed containers and keep them away from stoves, ovens, radiators and windows. Heat and light will destroy your herbs over a period of time.

A good cookbook will tell you in detail, but here are a few combinations you might want to try:
