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## Farmer's crop finds market in the mideast

Most people think of Canton farmers as truck farmers. They think of people who raise a little sweet corn and muskmelon to sell at a farmers' market or fruit stand.

Don M. Korte, of 6934 Beck, put that misconception to rest this month when he met with high-ranking officials in the European Economic Community (EEC). He hobnobbed with Egypt's minister of agriculture at another stop.

And he came back to Canton last week, beaming about the reception the bean farmers received in the world market.

Korte and 34 other soybean farmers made up the delegation organized by the American Soybean Association to drum up more business for the soybean. The cost of the two-week trip was underwritten by Elanco Products Co., the makers of a weed-killing herbicide.

No one in the world sits down to eat a bowl of soybeans. But soybean oil, the main ingredient in products such as Crisco oil and Parkay margarine, is being bought in large quantities by Egypt, according to Korte. And Iran was interested in increasing its import of soybean meal to fatten cattle and feed chickens.

"It's quite a process crushing soybeans to extract the oil," Korte said. "Egypt has no crushing units, so we sell them bulk basic soybean oil. Their need is 300,000 metric tons for their people. Egypt grows a lot of cotton and has cottonseed oil. But Egyptians are now demanding the higher quality, better-tasting soybean oil."

Korte says soybeans are an underrated and very flexible foodstuff. "It's a premium oil without an image," Korte complains. "Companies that use soybean oil will say 'made of 100 per cent vegetable oil' when they're talking about soybean oil."

THE HIGHLIGHT of the two-week trip had to be Egypt, Korte said.

"Talk about the cradle of civilization," said Korte. "There's so much history there that dates back so far, they haven't had time to decipher it all yet."

Describing a trip to the pyramids and a look at the tombs, Korte said "You just stand there in awe—in awe of the technological advances that were made back then."

The minister of agriculture in Egypt treated the U.S. farmers royally, he said.

Korte said he's traced the route of his soybeans in the past and found that some of his crop was shipped to Amsterdam, Holland and Tokyo, Japan. He either deals with a commodity broker in Detroit or takes his beans to Toledo's harbor installation to sell his product at the highest price he can garner.

Korte set aside 300 acres for soybean production last year, along with rows for sweetcorn and muskmelon. Soybean yields an average of 29

bushels per acre and sold for \$5 a bushel at harvest time in 1977.

"Bushel-wise we had our highest average yield here last year," Korte said. "It was somewhere between 10 to 15,000 bushels of soybeans."

## \$20,000 study on farms rapped

A study expected to steer Canton board members onto a path that would either preserve or develop the township's agricultural land has only bred confusion and the obligation to pay a \$20,000 to \$25,000 bill thus far.

The first segment of the report, presented by planning consultant George Peek Tuesday night, compares the 30-year cost to taxpayers of buying \$15.2 million in development rights from farmers to the cost of providing municipal services if the land were fully developed.

Most Canton Township board members were clearly disappointed in the 130-page mathematical computer printout that made up the report. Some said the document in its present form was useless.

Supervisor Harold Stein expressed hope, however, that the second portion of the report being compiled by the Seidman & Seidman accounting firm will analyze the pages of figures presented by planner Peek and tell Canton board members what they want to know.

The Seidman study is expected to cost the township an additional \$10,000 and bring the total cost of the completed study to \$30,000-\$35,000.

The Seidman report, which should be presented to the board at its April 11 meeting, will show the financial effect that buying farmers' development rights will have.

THE SEGMENT of the study conducted by Peek and the planning firm of Wade, Trim & Associates computed the yearly budget of the township over the next 30 years at different housing growth rates. A commitment to preserve or develop the township's farmland also was taken into consideration.

The report did not take into consideration the impact that development of the farmland would have on the township's three school districts because of the resulting increase of school-age children. It did not determine the increased tax burden on township resi-

dents who would need to build additional schools.

Instead, the study concentrated on the cost to the township of providing municipal services to a partially or fully developed 36-square-mile area.

With a "moderate" new-home construction rate, for example, Peek figured the township would have an operating budget of \$19 million and a population of 106,000 by the year 1998 if residential, commercial and industrial developments were constructed on 4,900 acres of present agricultural land.

The township would have to spend \$598 to provide municipal services to each household in 1998, planners figured, if the farmland was developed.

The cost of providing municipal services in 1998 would drop to \$578 per household if township officials decided to preserve the farmland in the west and new homes were constructed at a "moderate" rate. According to Peek's estimates, the township would then have a population of 102,000 and an operating budget of \$18 million.

BUT NOT EVEN PEEK seemed to know what light the study's findings could shed on the board's indecision to buy farmers' development rights to preserve the agricultural community.

"I have trouble dealing with all these numbers, too," Peek admitted.

Township board members and residents who attended Tuesday's meeting blasted Peek for his failure to assess the impact that development or non-development of farmland would have on the school systems.

Board members noted that most taxes paid by residents go to the schools, and full development of the township could increase those school tax rates. They unofficially asked Peek to assess the impact full development would have on the school.

"People invariably want to know, 'What is it going to cost me?'" said Clerk John Flodin. "It seems you have

## Liability rates rankle police

Like many other communities in Michigan, Canton had to go overseas to find companies willing to insure its police force. Not only do the township's insurers, two Milan, Italy firms, charge a lot for protection but neither is licensed to sell insurance in Michigan.

This is completely within the law, but the state would be powerless to intervene if either company failed to pay off a legitimate false arrest or accident claim.

Carl Parsell, executive director of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM), says police departments are insurance untouchables, much like surgeons.

Parsell, former Canton treasurer, is pulling the collective pantleg of state legislators this week trying to get them to create a state insurance "pool" that would guarantee false arrest and liability coverage to all police departments in the state.

"The same conditions that plagued Michigan doctors in their attempts to obtain malpractice insurance now face all law enforcement agencies in Michigan in their attempt to get liability insurance coverage for their officers," Parsell said.

"State officials should act with dispatch in order to prevent a chaotic situation from developing," Parsell continued. "Can you imagine police officers not getting involved in protecting the public because they are without (insurance) protection?"

Parsell cites the example of three county sheriff's departments—Oakland, Genesee, and St. Clair—that bought insurance from a company in

Bermuda when domestic insurance firms either turned them down or offered exorbitant rates.

The Bermuda firm is not licensed or approved to write insurance in Michigan by the state insurance commission.

"Because insurance companies are refusing to renew or write false arrest and liability coverage, law enforcement agencies are being forced to seek coverage from questionable mail-order insurance companies outside the country," Parsell said.

CANTON TOWNSHIP police officers are insured by two Italian firms—Riunione Adriatica Di Sicurtà and the Bellafonte Insurance Co. of Milan.

Nancy Zalewski, a corporate record investigator with the Michigan Insurance Commission, said Wednesday that Bellafonte is not licensed in Michigan but has been approved to write insurance because the firm meets the state's qualifications. Bellafonte's U.S. headquarters are in Ohio.

The other firm, Riunione Adriatica Di Sicurtà, is neither licensed nor approved to write insurance in Michigan, said Ms. Zalewski. This is not illegal, she explained, but it can be risky.

"The only problem would be if the company started giving them (Canton) problems on paying off claims," Ms. Zalewski said. "The state would not be involved in any way if the company is not licensed or approved."

Canton obtained the coverage locally through Fairlane Associates of Dearborn. Thomas Burr, Fairlane agent in charge of Canton's account, called Adriatica "one of the three largest

## Cop hiring suit in court today

Today is the day former police commander Carl Silvers and the irate Canton patrol officers go to court with a lawsuit against the township's proposed hiring procedure.

The show-cause hearing will be 2:30 p.m. today in Wayne County Circuit Judge Horace Gilmore's courtroom. An injunction prohibiting the township from filling four full-time sergeant jobs and 10 full-time patrol officer jobs is in effect.

Silvers and the Canton Police Officers Association (CPOA) are taking the position that they are entitled to four of the sergeant positions because they've been serving in that role in a part-time capacity. Further, the CPOA is fighting to prevent its members from having to take three tests the township is requiring of the 10 full-time patrol officers it hires.

Silvers will be represented by his attorney, Andrew Muth; the CPOA has retained James Garber. Bert Burgoyne is the township's legal counsel.

IT WAS BURGUYNE who advised Canton trustees to require six tests of new officers—including three exams

the CPOA finds "redundant."

The three tests the CPOA finds objectionable are a civil service-type exam, an agility test and a medical check-up demanded of all township employees. CPOA President John Longridge said all of Canton's 23 certified police officers passed even more demanding tests at the police academy within the past 18 months. Those test results could be used to rank in-house applicants, Longridge says.

The three new tests would delay 24-hour police protection for another six months, according to Longridge.

Silvers brought the lawsuit against the township and the CPOA intervened, telling the court the CPOA membership's interests would be affected by any decision made on Silvers' plea.

Silvers maintains, through his attorney, that the commander job he held when the force was formed was eliminated due to political considerations of current Supervisor Harold Stein.

Silvers claims Stein eliminated the commander job because the appointment was made by former supervisor Robert Greenstein.

Silvers is a retired 25-year veteran of the Detroit Police Department. He works during the day at the Detroit Post Office in security and at night with the Canton police department.



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# How schools make millages more palatable

The defeat this week of a 21-mill tax renewal by Dearborn voters sent shock waves through the educational community, reminding school administrators that a tax revolt is still alive and thriving.

Dearborn Public Schools had a proposal on Monday's ballot seeking renewal of 21 mills and an additional 3.75 mills for operating. The renewal and added millage were lumped together in one package, and voters defeated the issue by a resounding 2-1 margin.

The vote has prompted some administrators, who haven't already done so, to rethink the strategy of lumping renewals together and mixing renewals with requests for new millage.

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools administrators have avoided the strategy of putting all their renewal mills into one basket, but they have combined a renewal and a request for added millage into one proposal for the April 27 election.

ABOUT A DECADE ago, some school districts in the Detroit metropolitan area began to time their millage renewals so the lion's share would fall due at one time.

The idea was to force voters into a "do or die" frame of mind and obtain passage, rather than risking defeat of renewals of smaller amounts.

In more recent years, there has been a trend for school districts to combine requests for new millage with renewals. Because most voters accept renewals as necessary, and recognize no added tax in involved, the strategy was to win approval for added millage by including it in a renewal proposal.

Dearborn combined both strategies for Monday's election, with devastating results when voters said "no." The school district the next day had to send layoff notices to almost all its administrators and teaching staff, and is facing such major cutbacks that a reorganization of the district may be necessary.

IN PLYMOUTH-CANTON Community Schools, a deliberate attempt has been made to avoid having a large chunk of renewal millage fall due at one election.

Instead, the school district's "strategy" is to spread out renewals so that a tax election is necessary every other

year instead of once a year. The intent is to reduce election costs as well as to allow administrators to do some planning with assurance funds needed to operate will be available at least one year out.

The renewal and added millage requests have been combined for April 27 but not with any intent of playing games with voters, says Florence Beier, administrative assistant for community relations. "In fact, we put the issues into one proposal in reaction to what we feel voters have been telling us—that although they may not want an expanded program, they do want to maintain existing programs. Basically, that's what the April 27 proposal is—a 'maintenance' proposal to maintain the existing level."

A COUPLE YEARS ago, members of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education did discuss the option of spreading out millage renewals in such a way that 20 mills or more would fall due at one time. But trustees rejected the idea as an unwise millage strategy and as bad financial planning.

Instead the administration is timing renewals in such a way that they come due every other year instead of every year. Based on the present plan, the highest number of renewal mills which will fall due on any one year is 10.36 in the spring of 1981. Other renewals will

be for 3, 6½ and 8 mills.

"One reason for having renewals come up every other year is to save election costs," explained Mrs. Beier. "But a more important reason is to allow the administration and school board to plan. We have a \$36 million budget now, and if we only know one year out what our millage will be, it will be very difficult to do any meaningful planning."

"The idea of scaring voters into approving millage by putting having a large number of mills in one proposal is an old tactic. We don't play games with voters, but try to find out what they want in their schools and put a proposal on the ballot which meets

those desires."

ON APRIL 27 the district is seeking voter approval of 3 mills for renewal and 1½ new mills for operating.

"Everything the community has been saying, through polls, PACTS and other advisory committees, and from residents speaking directly to the board at meetings, suggests that residents wish to maintain the quality of the school district."

"And so we prepared a budget that would have allowed us to offer the same quality program to the students here next year. We then trimmed \$500,000 from that proposed budget, and so there is no 'fat' in the budget."

"When we looked at the financial resources needed to just maintain what now exists, we discovered it would take 1½ additional mills along with the 3-mill renewal."

"The 1½ mills really takes care of growth and inflation in the school district. It's not for any new programs, just to maintain what we have," added Mrs. Beier. "That's why I refer to it as a maintenance millage."

"Some school districts in the area are asking for five or six added mills, so you can see our request for 1½ new mills isn't really very much."

"In summary, because renewal of the three expiring mills plus 1½ mills

## President Carter waffles on local student's question

What would you say to Jimmy Carter if you had the opportunity to ask him any question you wanted?

Plymouth Township resident Paul Stanton wanted to know if the president had any plans for curbing inflation. And, as it turned out, Carter dodged the question.

"I guess my mistake was asking him a two-part question," Stanton observed in retrospect. "He concentrated on the second question without answering the first."

Stanton was one of 200 college students working on campus radios and newspapers who were selected to attend a presidential press conference in Washington, D.C., earlier this month.

Stanton is a senior at Spring Arbor College and the news director for the 3,000-watt campus radio station.

Of the 200 media people representing colleges and universities across the country, Paul was one of the 10 who were recognized by President Carter and got to ask their question.

AND IT WASN'T just blind luck. Stanton did his homework and came to the conference ready for action.

"As a broadcaster I always wondered how the president selected reporters to ask him questions at those

news conferences. So while I was in Washington last year, I talked to the head of the United Press International (UPI) Washington bureau, and he gave me a few tips," Paul said.

Basically the advice Stanton got boiled down to: come to the conference with a prepared list of questions, try to sit in the front row, and be the first one to raise your hand.

"It was good advice. I had my questions all set, and I got a seat toward the front of the room. And then when President Carter opened for questions, I jumped up and down, waved my arms and made faces at him."

"Finally, he called on me," Stanton said. "I couldn't believe it. There I was standing 10 feet away from the president of the United States, and he was giving me that grin of his."

At first, Stanton felt a little intimidated but he put his head down and plowed into his question.

Did the president have a clear-cut policy on cutting back inflation, and did he think a man recently appointed to a government economic office would do anything to stem spiraling prices?

Well, the second portion of the question gave Carter a chance to wax eloquent on his recent appointment without specifically saying whether he had a policy on inflation.

"He started talking about how he

had every confidence in the new man and things like that. But he jumped over the first part of the question," Stanton said.

"I thought about it for a while and decided I wasn't going to let him dodge me that easily, so I interrupted him and told him he wasn't answering my question."

"He stopped talking while I repeated the question, and then he started talking about inflation again. But when he finished, I still didn't know whether he had a policy on inflation."

Stanton, who plans on finishing his bachelor's degree in business administration this year, got his start in radio at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park station, WSDP, where he was local news director.

"When I graduated from high school, I had to make the decision of what to major in. I decided on business because I knew a lot of kids with broadcast majors who couldn't get jobs," he said.

## 1 library mill will be on ballot

The fate of a proposal to establish a Canton Township library is now up to you.

A proposition that would establish a library on the third floor of the township's new administration building through a maximum one-mill tax levy (\$1 per \$1,000 state

equalized value) will appear on the August ballot.

Members of the township's library committee made the ballot question a certainty this week with the successful collection of 50 signatures needed to take the library issue to the polls.

Although voters will be asked to approve one mill for the library, finance director Mike Gorman says he doubts township officials would have to levy the full amount.

Gorman believes township officials could finance the start-up and

operational costs of the library through a three-quarter mill (tax) (75 cents per \$1,000 state equalized value) the first year and a half mill tax (50 cents per \$1,000 state equalized value) the next three years.

State law requires municipalities to ask for

a maximum one-mill tax to support libraries, however.

Following an announcement that the library issue will appear on next August's ballot, township board members Tuesday unanimously approved a recommendation of the library committee to finish the third floor of the administration building at the present time.

Gorman figures the township could complete the third floor for the added cost of \$57,000 now while construction crews are still working on the administration building. The cost of completing the third floor would probably increase 35 percent if completion was put off to a later date.

If voters do not approve the proposition to establish a library, township officials say the administration's third floor could be put to another use.

A \$2.7 million federal grant is financing construction of the administration building. Because of an increase in construction costs since the building's architectural plans were submitted, the grant will not cover completion of the third floor. That money must come from township coffers.

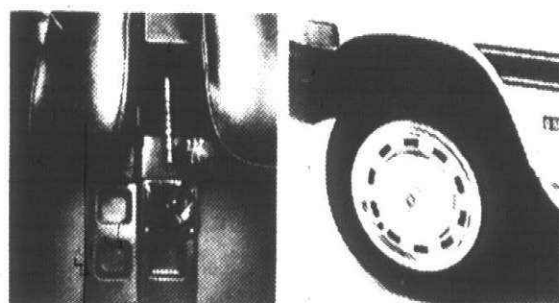

I just know that in winters I felt like an energy vampire, prowling parking lots, approaching people with my jumper cables, looking for another jolt of juice to keep me going.

The only thing I'll miss about the car is its dogged (as in dog) perseverance in the face of all

odds. Cars are not supposed to run without brakes, plugs, points, oil, condenser and a spare. But this one did—badly.

So it'll be tough to say good-bye to the old jalopy. It always is a traumatic experience. I just hope the dealer leaves me alone with it for a minute to pay my respects and wipe a tear of transmission fluid from its undercarriage.

Enough of the eulogy. Don't get me wrong, I still hate cars and would rather be sucked to work in a pneumatic tube. But until this new car starts disintegrating, I'll direct my anger at the insurer of automobiles, not the car itself.

THIS IS NOT a remark I make lightly or without experience.

When I went to school in Lansing—the home of the campus police, East Lansing Police, Lansing Police, State Police and Ingham County Sheriffs—I racked up four tickets in the space of two years. Police figured anyone driving a car that looked that bad deserved a ticket.

So I was forced to get insurance from the bad driver pool, a murky lagoon inhabited by off-brand insurance companies. This year I crawled out of that pool because old points drop off.

But in those dark days I carried insurance from the redoubtable Old Reliable Fireman's Insurance Co.; the Cavalier Insurance Co., a title that summed up their attitude toward their clients; and finally, the Dairyland Insurance Co.

I think the latter's motto was: "Milk 'em for all they're worth."

Because I felt that anyone who stole my beat-up Duster would be getting what they deserved, I didn't carry any theft coverage on the car.

A month later I got a call from the insurance agent informing me that my rates were going up because I lived in a high theft zone. Incredulously, I asked why that mattered since I had no theft protection.

"We knew you wouldn't be happy," was the woman's heartfelt response.



# Cars, trucks go on auction block

Canton Township has auction block plans for an assortment of used cars, trucks, DPW machinery and office supplies that have worn out their welcome at township hall.

Although the date for the auction has not been set, finance director Mike Gorman expects the sale will be scheduled sometime in April or May in the DPW yard, next to township hall on Geddes near Michigan.

Treasurer Ahne Bradley said supervisors of each township department were asked to contribute items no longer needed by employees for the sale. Proceeds will go into the general fund or water department budget.

Items for the auction block include a 1960 Ford truck, a 1956 Dodge truck, a 1970 Ford pickup, a 1971 Ford van, a 1973 Plymouth, a 1974 Ford, a 1970 van, a 1973 van, automobile tires, assorted tools, a welder, desks, chairs, a cash register, an adding machine and assorted parts for tractors and DPW machinery.

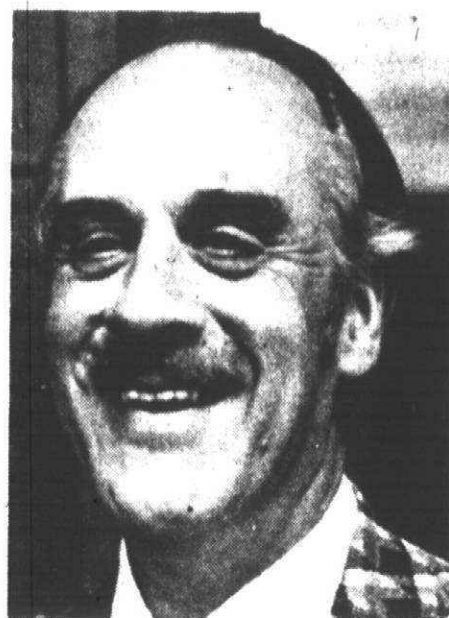
Mrs. Bradley said the cars, trucks and vans were used by employees of

# Officers' Italian insurance firm isn't licensed by state

insurance companies in Italy" and said that the company is approved to write municipal insurance in the state of New York.

Burr said Canton was forced to buy what is called "surplus line" insurance because domestic policies "are drying up."

The township pays the two Italian firms a total of \$25,486 for insurance on officers and protection against lawsuits.

Bellefonte is paid \$16,000 yearly for \$100,000 worth of liability coverage on each officer. Adriatica is paid \$9,486 annually for \$200,000 worth of additional protection, covering such occurrences as false arrest.

That price works out to be more than \$700 in insurance premiums per officer. In 1976, the year the Canton police department formed, Canton paid approximately \$100 insurance per officer.

"The rates more than quadrupled

overnight," said Mike Gorman, Canton's finance director.

POAM executive director Parsell says he's going to ask state representatives to "legislate morality" by forcing insurance companies to take on some of the less profitable accounts such as police and fire protection.

Agent Burr said the municipal insurance market is looking so bad, cities and townships may have to self-insure or form a municipal insurance pool, as Parsell urges.

for growth and inflation can support continuation of our present level of operation, it seemed clearest to offer that choice to the voters."

**THE HISTORY** of successful millage elections in Plymouth-Canton follows:

• August 1973, 1½ additional millage approved with 54 per cent of voters approving the levy through 1977.

• June 1973, a 1½ mill renewal for five years through 1977 with 65 per cent voting yes.

• June 1974, a 6½ renewal for five years through 1978 with 76 per cent voting yes.

• June 1975, a 0.46 additional millage and a 5.15 renewal approved for six years through 1980 by almost 52 per cent yes vote on new mills and 70 per cent yes on renewal.

• September 1976, a 4.75 additional levy approved for five years through 1980 with almost 50 per cent voting yes.

• April 1977, a five-mill renewal approval for six years through 1982 with almost 52 per cent voting yes.

With the expiration of the above proposals, the future renewal millage elections schedule thus far is: Spring 1978, three mills for five years; spring 1979, 6½ mills for six years; spring 1981, 10.36 mills for six years; spring 1983, eight mills for six years; and spring 1985, 6½ mills for six years.

Unless new millage is added, the cycle would continue with renewal requests for eight mills in 1988, and for 6½ mills in 1990.

In 1977-78, the total school tax levy

was 38 mills (\$38 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation) of which 33.76 was for operation and 4.24 for debt retirement on building bonds.

On April 27 the district also is asking voter approval of a special ½-mill operating levy for building improvements and maintenance for 10 years.

If voters approve the 4½-mill and ½-mill proposal, the total levy for 1978-79 would be about 40.25 mills depending upon how much debt retirement actually has to be levied to pay off bonds. In 1976-77, the total levy was 39.95 mills.

In nearby districts, Northville Public Schools is asking voters for 5½ added mills for a total levy of 45.42, Livonia is asking for 5.7 added mills for a total levy of 46.96, and Wayne-Westland next year will levy 44.82 mills.

Tom Yack, president of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education, attended Tuesday's meeting to hear Peek's report and appeared miffed at the study's findings.

"There isn't anything to even comment on," Yack said of the report.

Flodin declined comment on the work of the study until the Seidman & Seidman report is ready.

"But without evaluating the cost to the schools, the value of the report is marginal," he said. "If the \$25,000 spent for the Wade, Trim study turns out to be not well spent, then I admit I made a mistake in voting for it."

## ORDINANCE NO. 78-3 CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHIGAN

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 8.1 OF CHAPTER 98 OF TITLE VIII, BUILDING REGULATIONS, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH:

#### THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Section 8.1 of Chapter 98 of Title VIII, General Building Regulations, is hereby amended to read as follows:

8.1 Adoption of Codes by Reference. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 3(k) of Act 279, of Public Acts 1909, (M.S.A. 5.2073), State of Michigan) as amended, the Basic Building Code, 1978 Edition, and any accumulative supplements thereto, as promulgated and published by the Building Officials Conference of America, Inc. and the Housing Law of Michigan, are hereby adopted by references by the City of Plymouth as herein modified for the purpose of regulating the erection, construction, enlargement, equipment, alteration, repair, moving, removal, demolition, conversion, use, height, area and maintenance of all buildings and structures in the City of Plymouth.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 11th day of April A.D. 1978.

Made, passed and adopted by the City Commission of the City of Plymouth, Michigan, this 20th day of March A.D. 1978.

# Courting the middle class Tax break for college is proposed

Congress is courting the middle class.

It is trying to stem a rising tide of discontent among taxpayers who pay the most of taxes.

"What do they get in return?" asked U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth). "Now's our chance to give them some benefits. Until now, all the benefits have gone to other people in other areas," he continued.

Congress is trying to give middle income taxpayers a hand in putting their children through college. Until now, most federal aid has gone to low income families.

THERE IS disagreement, however, over what form this aid will take.

Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor) and President Jimmy Carter have teamed up to back a proposal to expand current financial aid programs to include the children of middle income families.

Another proposal, which has the strong support of Rep. William Broomfield (R-Birmingham) would grant income tax credits of up to \$500 to middle income families.

AN ATTEMPT by the Carter Administration to muscle its proposal through the House of Representatives failed recently by a 156-218 vote.

Democratic leaders, hoping to advance an aid package without income tax credits for tuition, brought the bill to the floor under a procedure that prevented any amendments.

Those representatives from the Observer & Eccentric area voting for the immediate adoption of the Carter-Ford financial aid plan were: David Bonior (D-Mt. Clemens), William Brodhead (D-Detroit), James Blanchard (D-Pleasant Ridge) and Ford.

Pursell and Broomfield opposed immediate adoption.

"The Carter Administration gave us

their program on a 'take it or leave it' basis," Broomfield said. "Congress left it."

Pursell concurred: "They just tried to pull a fast one on us."

Despite the defeat of the Carter-Ford proposal, the issue of middle income aid is not dead. Supporters of tuition tax credits and expanded financial aid programs hope to have the programs ready to roll in September.

Pursell attacked the side-effects of the Carter-Ford plan. "It would create a whole new bureaucracy in HEW (the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare). It's already the most expensive bureaucracy in the whole country," he said.

According to Pursell, the income tax credit plan, which would cost \$1.2 billion in the first year, would be easier to administer and would reduce the amount of red tape with which parents have to contend. "It's just a simple check off on your income tax form," Pursell said.

## FORD DISAGREES

The Carter-Ford proposal, which would pump \$1.2 billion more into existing aid programs, recommends removing income restrictions from most current financial aid programs.

The Ford-Carter recommendations include:

- Removing all income limits from the National Guaranteed Student Loan program.

- Making families with annual earnings of up to \$26,000 eligible for Basic Educational Opportunity Grants. The maximum grant under this program would be raised from \$1,600 to \$1,800.

- Expanding the College Work-Study Program.

- Expanding the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant Program.

"OUR BASIC intent," Ford said, "is to give students the opportunity to put together a financial aid package to cover the cost of their education."

"In the past targeting the financial aid at low income groups has been very successful," he said.

"Believe me, you'll get the most bang from your buck by targeting your money," he continued.

Ford added that under an expansion of current financial aid programs, "virtually everybody" would have the

chance to get a community college education for free.

"Annual tuition at a junior college averages \$300. Under the tuition credit, you could only claim half that amount, \$150. But by putting together a financial aid package, you could probably cover all that tuition cost," he said.

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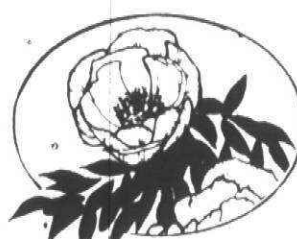

## Edison has finally wised up

Remember how your parents used to pay the monthly bills?

Legend has it that the head of the household would stand at the top of the stairs with all the bills in hand, toss them down, and walk to the bottom of the stairs. He would then pick them up, starting with the one on the first step and working upwards.

He used that method because all the bills couldn't be paid out of an existing month's income. The bill-payer didn't want to cheat any of his creditors, however, and so he relied on the "toss 'em down the stairs" method.

The main idea was equity. No conscious choice was made as to which creditor wouldn't be paid—it was all left to chance.

In a crude sort of way, random choice somehow equated to justice. Although crude, the system apparently helped the debtor deal with any bad feelings he had for not paying all debts when due.

WHEN I STARTED out married life and was faced with the problem of monthly bills, I was forced to skip this method because I was living in a one-story home without stairs.

And so I developed a system which could be described as the "kick and punt" method of paying bills. I collect the bills as I receive them, and store them in a drawer—unopened. I don't pay the bills as they arrive so that I can maintain the minimum balance needed in my account to get free checking.

When the fourth week of the month comes around, the bills come out of the drawer. Checks are made out for all bills—except one—and the bills are "kicked out of the house and into the mail box. The one bill I withhold is the monthly mortgage payment.

The mortgage payment I hold onto for five more days, "punt" it into the mail box on Sunday and hope it doesn't come down into my account before my next deposit is made. So far my punts have been high enough to allow my deposits to be recorded before the mortgage check lands.

THE KICK AND PUNT method has worked very well—for me.

But it has caused problems for some of my creditors who want payments made at a certain date each month. Because of my system, these creditors never get my payments when they want because they continually ask for it at the wrong time.

Detroit Edison is a good example. For years Edison has had problems with its billing cycle. Even though my paying habits have been regular for years, Edison has been unable to adjust its billing cycle with my paying cycle. I had thought, in this age of computers, that it would be a simple task for them to record the time my payments are received, recognize the pattern, and then adjust the billing cycle accordingly.

And so each month I receive an Edison bill which shows a "past due" amount which really isn't past due. I know I paid it, and by now Edison did too, but it was too late because the new bill had already gone out before the old payment had come in.

So for years I ignored their "past due" recordings, and they ignored by payment cycle. Until this month.

When I got my last bill a notice was enclosed that beginning next month my Edison bill would fall due a week later than it now does. Great! Edison finally has adjusted its billing cycle to my paying cycle. No more will my future bills include "past due"

amounts which really aren't past due.

Now all I have to do is convince Consumer Power, Michigan Bell, Standard Oil and Hudson's to follow suit. That's what consumer education is all about—consumers educating business about such important things as the proper time to submit a bill for payment.

One consumer tip explains that Michigan attorneys provide information about their charges for initial consultations in their listings.

Such listings tell the public whether an attorney or law firm will initially discuss legal problems at no cost, for a limited fee or for a fee obtainable by telephone.

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# Occupational therapy is upgraded at Schoolcraft

Schoolcraft College is upgrading its occupational therapy program, starting a program in how to manage a beauty shop and beginning a technical drafting certificate program.

All three curriculum changes were approved March 23 by the board of trustees based on recommendations from Dean Thad Diebel and the applied sciences faculty.

THE OCCUPATIONAL therapy assistant program is being upgraded

from a one-year certificate program to a two-year associate degree program.

Masline Horton, instructor-coordinator, said "the trend is to make these programs into associate degree programs across the country."

"Further, the student will be able to transfer to programs in occupational therapy at senior colleges and universities."

Graduates work as assistants to registered occupational therapists in general hospitals, psychiatric hospitals,

nursing homes and day-care centers. The OT program is one of the health careers.

Mrs. Horton told the board that persons taking the Schoolcraft course have "100 per cent passage" of the written national examination, and as a group have scored above the national norm.

The new two-year program is expected to enroll a total of 48 students by the second year. One more faculty

member will be needed, but costs for consultants will be reduced.

LICENSED cosmetologists requested that Schoolcraft offer the cosmetology management program, which will lead to an associate of applied science degree.

The 30-credit program was developed by Dean Diebel working with the West Suburban Affiliate Organization of the Michigan Cosmetologist Association.

"Students will be given 30 credit hours toward an associate degree based on evidence of having a State Board of Cosmetology license, and having successfully completed 15 credit hours at Schoolcraft," said Diebel. Potential enrollment is 20 to 30.

Required will be two English courses, one psychology course in human relations, one in speech, one in political science, three in business, one in accounting and one in business

math, for a total of about 33 credit hours.

THE TECHNICAL drafting program was developed by Diebel, Assistant Dean Fernon Feenstra and the drafting department working with area employers and an advisory committee.

Anticipated enrollment is 12 in the 26 credit hour program. Students will be eligible for employment as draftsmen and then may continue toward an associate degree.

The licenses are on sale at the treasurer's office. If purchased before May 31, the cost is \$3. After May 31, the price jumps to \$5.

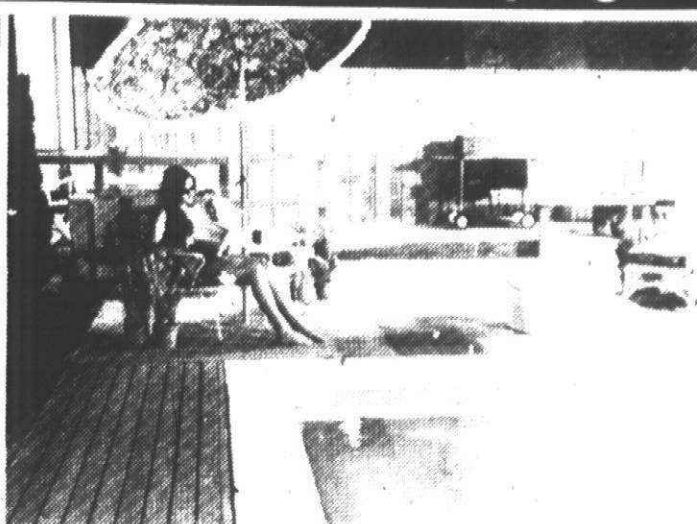
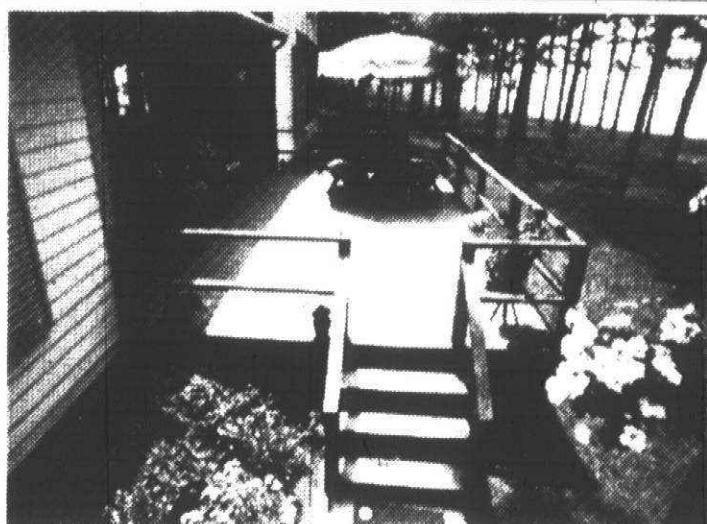
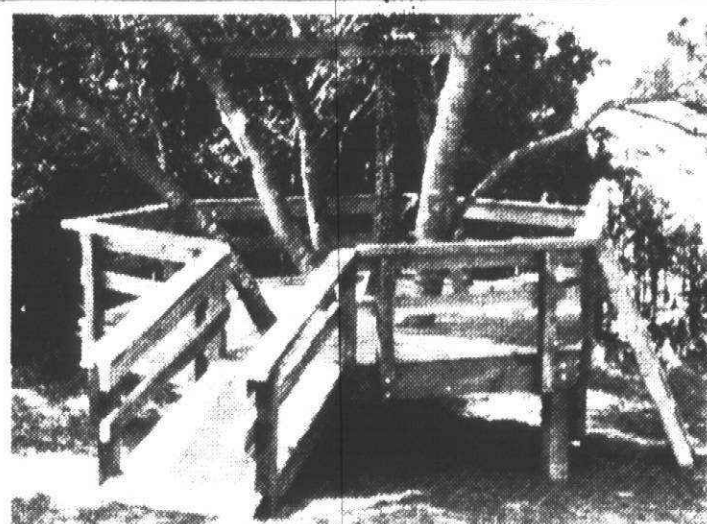
All licenses must be purchased by June 1.

But something unusual happened this year. It rained.

There were no parades down the avenues that have been made famous by song and story. For a change, some of the spotlight was turned to the great changes men's fashions through the years.

Too disappointed even to look out his window, The Stroller just sat back and recalled the many changes in men's styles he has seen in the passing years.

IT SEEMS almost like a wild dream that there was a time when men wore winged collars to the highest society affairs. If you didn't wear the winged collar and the cravat tie, you were sort of frowned upon.

Among the poorer classes—to which The Stroller held membership—the male of the species wore celluloid collars. Yes, they were washable. When a fellow wanted to dress up for an evening, he took a cloth and scrubbed the collar.

For other wearing apparel, the boys wore bloomers, which later were dignified by being referred to as "plus-fours." There were no such things as slacks in those days. And in contrast to the longhair today, it was fashionable to raise what was called a pompadour. This was done by retiring at night with a towel placed over your head to hold the hair back. In many cases, Vaseline was used to help keep the hair in place.

But in all cases, a fellow never went out of an evening to any sort of gathering without a tie and a jacket. Those were the days when the feeling was that clothes make the man.

THE STROLLER well remembers the day he was given his first out-of-town assignment as a member of The Detroit Free Press sports staff. He was called into the managing editor's office where kindly old Phil Reid, one of the old school of journalists, talked to him like a father.

"I want you to be clean-shaven every day," he said, "and I want you to wear pressed trousers, a clean shirt and tie, and stay at the best hotel."

"Remember," he went on, "when you leave this office, you are the show window of the paper. We will be

judged by your appearance and the manner in which you behave."

It was a talking-to that The Stroller never forgot. And to this day, he never has appeared at the office or an assignment without a tie, a clean shirt and a clean-shaven face.

No one ever dreamed the day would come when the younger element would turn to casual dress—open shirts, no ties, blue jeans and hair that fell down their backs, beards and mustaches and canvas shoes.

BUT THAT HAS happened, much to the dismay of the old-timers. It is difficult to believe now that there was a time when the fashion designers tried to foist pinch-back coats with high, pointed lapels on the young men. But they didn't buy, and the style returned to the staid, old customs.

A few years ago, they did succeed in getting men to be bold enough to wear checkered slacks and sport coats. They even went so far as to have white stitching around the pockets and lapels—a style that left the impression the tailor hadn't finished his job. But long hair, beards, mustaches and blue jeans—never.

The latest trend has divided the men's ranks. Steadfastly, the elder

generation criticizes the long hair, the open shirts, the baggy trousers.

In fact, a friend of The Stroller commented the other day that one of these modern-dressed chaps served as an usher in the church.

"When he passed the collection plate in our pew," our friend said, "and I noticed that he wore an open neck shirt and no tie, I became so disgusted that I hesitated before dropping my offering on the plate. I came close to almost letting the plate pass me by."

And The Stroller can't help wondering what kindly old Phil Reid would have thought. One thing sure: The young fellow never would have been sent out on an assignment.

## Pursell pushing laser fusion use

Laser fusion is not a high-priority item in the national energy plan, but it has Rep. Carl Pursell's (R-Plymouth) wholehearted support.

Fusion, Pursell says, could "help to free the United States from its risky wager on foreign energy sources."

Pursell and the rest of the House Science and Technology Committee recently approved an \$8.8 million increase in the 1979 fiscal year energy budget. The Carter Administration had recommended that the fusion budget be cut by \$3 million, from \$129 million to \$126 million.

"Congress recognizes the vast potential of fusion energy, and is not willing to accept a funding cut in a program vital to our energy supply. Cutting back on energy research at this precarious moment would be unbelievable folly," Pursell said.

A MAJOR beneficiary of the proposed increase in the fusion program is KMS Fusion of Ann Arbor, the leading industrial participant in the fusion program. Of the \$8.8 million increase, \$3.8 million is earmarked for research and development at KMS Fusion.

It was KMS Fusion which whetted Pursell's interest in laser fusion.

LASER FUSION, until recently, was considered the private property of the Pentagon. It has now been recognized as a potentially inexhaustible energy source.

The highly technical process forces two hydrogen isotopes together until the particles fuse. The fusion produces a vast amount of heat which can be used to make steam and generate electricity.

It is considered an "inexhaustible" energy form because the necessary hydrogen could be derived from water molecules.

Fusion, joining particles together, is different from fission. Fission also yields large amounts of energy but requires splitting apart such elements as uranium and plutonium.

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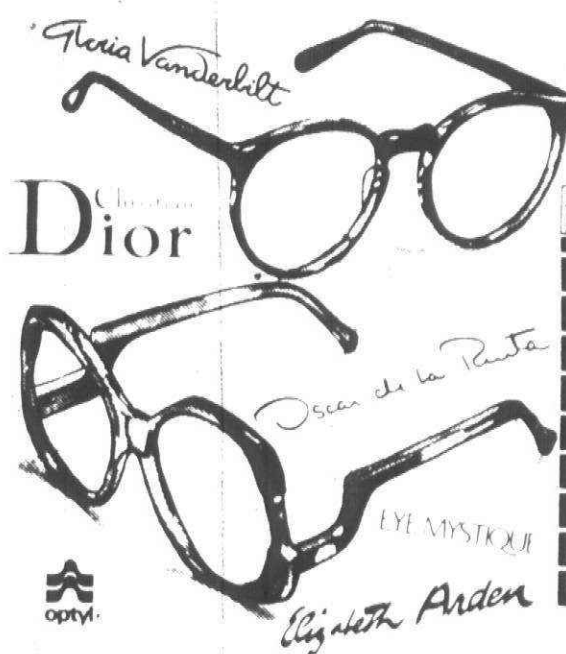

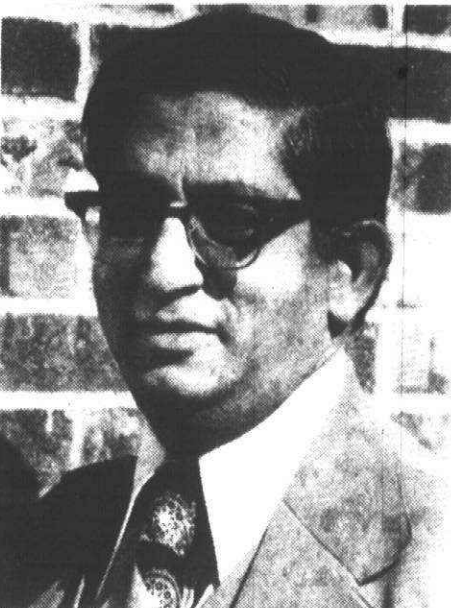

# Jailhouse psychologist's poetry reveals philosophy of non-violence

Canton resident **Srinibas Bhattacharya** has published a new book of poetry entitled, "Our Sweetest Songs." The slender volume is rich in the psychologist's belief in the importance

of harmony and balance in the universe and individual lives.

Its publication brings together poems written over a period of years, which Bhattacharya has grouped into three major themes.

The first section explores life; the second, love; and the third, peace. Bhattacharya uses simple but eloquent language to put the three complex themes into an understandable framework.

As a college student in India, he came under the influence of Gandhi, the statesman of non-violence, and the poems reflect a gentle spirit.

Bhattacharya has written of peace before, most notably in his book, "The Long Road to Peace," which he characterizes as a summary of his philosophy that individual conflicts lead to conflicts throughout society.

Although he admits he is a psychologist and educator first, Bhattacharya explains that his interest in poetry and literature is a natural offshoot of his interest in human behavior.

"Poetry is one of the best ways in

the world to reach inside a person's heart and pluck his finer strings," he said.

"And once you reach the heart and the feelings, it is possible to change someone's actions and way of thinking."

Bhattacharya has used "poetry therapy" with some of the inmates he has worked with at the state prison in Jackson. By reading his poetry and

encouraging them to write their own, he tries to give them an insight into why they act as they do.

Since coming to the United States 15 years ago, Bhattacharya has worked with retarded children, taught at the University of Michigan and published a number of books.

His first book of verse was entitled, "Green and Gold."

Gifted child  
explodes myth

Saturday afternoon I was watching Duke University win a thriller from Notre Dame in the semi-finals of the NCAA basketball championships.

And, curiously, my wife said something that made me stop and think.

"Contrary to popular belief," she half-murmured during a particularly exciting portion of the action, "intellectually gifted children are not physical weaklings."

"What is that supposed to mean," I asked.

"That center for Duke. He's a gifted child," she responded.

THE "CHILD" she was talking about is 6-11 Mike Gminski. It seems the announcer mentioned Gminski had completed high school in two years graduating at 16 and that he is already a sophomore at Duke and only 18 years old. And, naturally, he's an all-A student.

All the kid did Saturday was score 24 points and sweep the Notre Dame backboards clean of rebounds.

Well, I'll have to admit that subconsciously I have always associated intellectually-gifted students with frailty, the arts and mathematics. But, at least according to the expert in my house, the facts don't support this assumption.

All of which leaves me wondering why Michigan can't find a Mike Gminski?

AND WHILE my perspective of the intellectually talented was being corrected, it also occurred to me that there's a little irony involved in the federal government's latest retirement law.

Not long ago (within my memory, at least) critics were demanding retirement at age 65 so that after many years in the work harness we could relax and enjoy the good life.

Now similar voices with their criticism aimed at the same targets are declaring that the retirement age should be extended to 70. It seems that, at age 65, today's retiree is being turned out to pasture just when he reaches productivity heights.

Actually, of course, we're living longer and maintaining our physical and mental capabilities well past the age of 65. Then, too, it's possible that many are finding the "good life" of retirement is not all it's cracked up to be.

Whatever, it presents a challenge for American ingenuity. If employees stay on the job longer, the opportunities for newcomers entering the job market are reduced.

So we must provide more jobs.

Or... maybe if the government delays payment of Social Security benefits an additional five years, it could take those dollars and subsidize the "good life" for unemployed youngsters age 18-25.

It's sort of a reverse twist. Instead of "retiring" at 65, you start out on social security for five years. That way when you reach retirement age you already have had experience in idleness.

## Territory time

The signs of spring are too many to count, but it's not official, in our book, until one loud-mouthed fellow says so.

He's the red-winged blackbird. The male arrives first, staking out a territory in the cattails along a lake or stream. He sings out to lure mates.

The male red-winged blackbird seeks a harem, and so he has a lot of calling to do as he invites ladies to his chosen territory. Among birds, the more brightly colored the male is, the less monogamous he tends to be. You can't tell a male from a female among Canada geese; but since they mate for life, they have no need for colorful sexual differentiation.

If Samson's strength was due to his hair, the red-winged blackbird's prowess is due to that red patch on his shoulder. Experimenters have painted that patch black and found the sheik was immediately deprived of his territory and harem by a bachelor bird. Once the black paint wore off, the experimental bird was able to regain his section of the marsh and his ladies.

There's not much unique about the red-winged blackbird. His kind is found almost from coast to coast. As an insect-eater, he has to head for warmer climes in winter, and he's not much for cities or hills. He's a bright and bold fellow, and when he stakes out his territory and tells you it's spring, you'd better believe it.

## Antique county has a super price

We greet with a cynical smile the latest political news wafting from the 13th floor of 2 Woodward Avenue, home of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and various other departments of the antiquated form of government.

The latest news is that John Barr is the latest elected commissioner to get himself appointed to an administrative job in county government at about double his old salary.

Earlier in the year, two other commissioners, summoning all the facts, logic and ability at their joint disposal, got themselves appointed to head the "super sewer" project, with super salary increases, of course.

WHAT'S GOING on? It's not so much corrupt as it is sad.

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is an administrative body as much as it is a legislative body.

Certain department heads in county government are elective — the sheriff, prosecutor, clerk, treasurer, register of deeds and drain commissioner. The other departments — hospital, welfare, extension and the like — report to the 27 commissioners.

And so, while it may look a little funny, it's entirely proper for the commissioners to seek administrative promotion, as it were, in operating departments of county government.

It's not like the federal government, where an independently elected president leads the administrative branch and 535 members of Congress make the budget and laws.

Nor is it like your local school board, where seven elected trustees make policy and hire a superintendent who is the chief operating officer. County government is antiquated, sad and more than a little weird.

THE IDEA that the board of commissioners is elected requires a footnote.

There has been so much turnover among the 27 commissioners that about half, give or take a couple, originally got their jobs by appointment. The new chairperson, Jarrette Simmons, came into office that way. Our own Tom Presnell, who represents Garden City and Westland, and Bill Joyner of Plymouth Township came aboard that way.

A lot of union politics is involved. Once appointed, the commissioners are rarely dislodged by the bewildered electorate.

It's like that with the elected department heads. Not a single one — Prosecutor Bill Cahalan, Sheriff Bill Lucas, Clerk Jim Kilien and all the rest — not one, we say, got his job originally from the electorate. Every one got it by appointment. So did all their predecessors.

The appointment process for replacing someone like a sheriff is obscure. Tiny little committees of other officeholders get together to make the appointments. Again, a lot of union politics is involved.

SOME OF US wild-eyed radicals would like to see a change. We'd like to see county government reorganized so that the board of commissioners is a truly legislative body, and the administrative end is headed by a county executive (elected) or manager (appointed by the board, like a city manager).

Among our fellow radicals in this regard are the aforementioned John Barr, Commissioner Mary Dumas of Livonia and Commissioner Richard Manning of Redford.

Then we'd like to see a strong county home rule amendment to the state constitution that would allow counties to write city-style charters. With those tools, we could make our appointments of prosecutor, sheriff, clerk and all the rest through the rational process of the county executive system rather than through obscure, tiny little committees and a lot of union politics.

Meanwhile, we must continue to read the news wafting from 2 Woodward Avenue with a cynical smile.

is in anguish

I shouldn't laugh at another human being's discomfort. It isn't nice.

But the truth is that I did laugh at the anguish Joe H. Stroud went through in his column in last Sunday's Detroit Free Press.

I'm good enough at editing so that I not only look for spelling and libel; I can also tell when a writer is having fun, when his work is a chore or when he doesn't believe his own words. Joe Stroud was in anguish. He announced he is moving out of Detroit and into a suburb.

You have to appreciate Joe's position: The Free Press is a "booster" of Detroit, in chamber of commerce terminology. Last year I analyzed, in great detail, how the Free Press carefully applies such words as "civic statesmen" to the folks at Renaissance Center while suburban businessmen come off as "promoters" and other unflattering appellations.

YEP, JOE was in anguish. "A wrenching change." Two older children gone off to college or elsewhere. Concern for "my wife (who) has chosen not to work outside the home; many of the new neighbors consist of husbands and wives who both work."

The deciding factor, it seems, was "the pull of the idea of the dream house, the home that suits your current needs, the home that your resources make possible."

He was defensive, nevertheless, about his move. He tells us he's leaving a good neighborhood, not abandoning ship: "We have struggled over the years to help, in such ways as we could, with the strength of the neighborhood institutions."

He tells us he isn't fleeing: "I do not turn my back on a bad neighborhood or bad neighbors now; there are good people trying to see that a good neighborhood continues to work."

He blushes as he writes: "In some ways, the move troubles me deeply, especially since I have so often written about the struggle to make the city work." Indeed, it isn't until the 10th paragraph that he mentions his new home is in a suburb.

"I have loved being a city dweller and not a suburbanite." The tone is like a Bible Belt Baptist confessing he's becoming high-church Episcopalian.

IT IS WRILY amusing that a man's mind is so full of small-town politics that he must use one-fourth of the editorial page of a big daily paper to apologize for buying a new house in the 'burbs.

Actually, Joe Stroud will be right at home in the suburbs, if he's that worried about Detroit.

RenCen is essentially a suburban concept — Henry Ford II of the Pointes, Max Fisher of Franklin Village.

The Detroit Symphony's chief fund-raiser is from Bloomfield Hills. Joe will find the symphony's major patrons in the suburbs. If Southfield were bombed, the orchestra would be gone.

Friends of the Detroit Library says 60 per cent of its members are non-residents of the City of



Detroit. In other words, they're suburbanites.

Covering a state Natural Resources Commission meeting in the Belle Isle nature center, I overheard two ladies behind a desk say they were volunteers, one from Birmingham, the other from the Pointes. Joe should be very comfortable with neighbors like that.

DETROIT DOESN'T subsidize its bus system. The state and federal governments do, with suburban money. D-DOT's pension funding comes from the state.

As a commuter, Joe will pay Detroit's non-resi-

dent income tax, without which the city would be in worse shape.

The art institute subsidy... the library subsidy... urban grants... the historical museum subsidy... the "municipal overburden" subsidy to Detroit schools... the bilingual education subsidy that goes mostly to Detroit... the riverfront development subsidies...

Joe Stroud will have little problem adjusting to a new neighborhood.

Besides, moving from Detroit's Rosedale to a suburb hardly is a cultural shock.

### Hendry spokesperson raps Observer reporter

Editor: I would like to respond to Glenn Bunting's reporting of the situation at the Hendry Convalescent Center, regarding Medicaid patients.

In all of Bunting's reporting, not once does he mention the quality of care given to all patients at Hendry Convalescent Center. The Medicaid patients have had no complaints; the only complaint is that the state refuses to pay for the care the patient requires and deserves.

If Bunting looked beyond the surface, he would find in Mr. Hendry a concerned man who personally shops at Eastern Market to choose the fresh foods that will be prepared for patient meals; a man who is personally assured that the patients are given quality care; a man who purchased grave sites out of personal funds for patients who may die and have no final resting place.

As Bunting admitted to me in our telephone conversation, if it is ever necessary to have a loved one in his family in a convalescent center, he would want them in a home like Hendry operates.

Bunting would do well to spend his energy reporting the problems as they

exist with the Medicaid program, rather than emulate the Watergate journalist looking for something of a disgrace that doesn't exist at Hendry. The Medicaid program grossly underpays for patient care to a point of becoming a national disgrace.

The program prohibits a family member to contribute \$1 a week toward a family member's care, even if they have \$50 a week to spare.

I am proud to be associated with the member facilities of Health Saving Services, to which Hendry Convalescent Center belongs. If I reach a time in my life that I need convalescent care, I pray that centers like the one Hendry and the other Health Saving Services member facilities operate, still exist.

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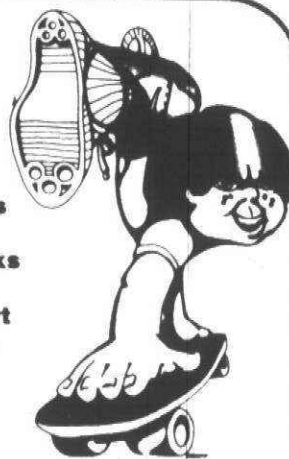
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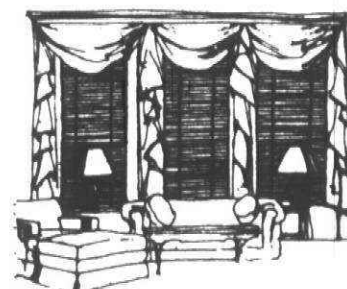

"Will I have anyone to talk to?"

This is a question that is often asked members of First Step, the area group organized to aid battered women. Not only are the women looking for the protection of a shelter, they also want someone to listen to them and discuss their problem.

In this area, First Step has already arranged for three rap groups for battered women, one in Westland, one in Plymouth and one in Livonia.

One has been meeting for several months in Westland Parks and Recreation Center on Dorsey, east of Venoy. A new one is about to start at Catholic Social Services, 17316 Farmington, Livonia. The first session will be held from 10 a.m. until noon on Tuesday, March 28.

Leaders will be Judy Nowicki and Linda Meloragni. Those interested may call the agency at 421-3730.

Our House Crisis Center, 185 S. Har-

vey, Plymouth, is the location of another rap session to start Tuesday, April 11. Hours will be from 7-9 p.m. Karen Reeber is leader. For information call the center at 455-4900.

Sylvia Ruen leads the sessions in the Westland Center on Friday from 1:30-3 p.m. To join, call her at 292-5690.

"We already have 12 women in the Westland group," said Sheila Nobriga of Livonia, First Step board member, who has been working on forming these new groups. "At each meeting we are getting one or two new women," she said. "Before they had to go to."

**WHILE PLEASED** to have started to fill the need for rap groups, First Step still has its collective heart set on establishing a shelter for battered women.

The organization recently made a request to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners to be allowed to use a two-story brick building at the Wayne

County General Hospital complex in Westland as a shelter.

An appeal of this subject was made last week to the human relations committee of the commission by the Rev. Doug Hodges, co-chairman of First Step.

"The building is in good shape," reported Ms. Nobriga. She said there would be room for counseling and play space in the basement for children brought in by beaten women.

The group has also applied for \$40,000 from the city of Westland to further the shelter project.

**FIRST STEP** has been disappointed to discover how little money there is available to aid battered women.

"We thought that \$50,000 was available for a state emergency shelter pilot project," noted Mary Ann Pinkerton of Plymouth, co-chairman of the group and temporary representative of Wayne County to the newly formed Michigan Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

"But instead of it going for shelters for battered women it was used by the Adult Protective Services Agency for housing elderly patients recently out of the hospital. It turns out that the department handling the money has nothing to do with domestic assault.

"Domestic assault is not mentioned at all in the governor's budget, so there will be no money coming in for these women. We have learned there is \$25 million available at the federal level, but that divides out to about \$500,000 per state.

"First Step feels that to set up a 365-day shelter with a counselor on call to serve about 20 women and their children would cost of \$200,000 a year.

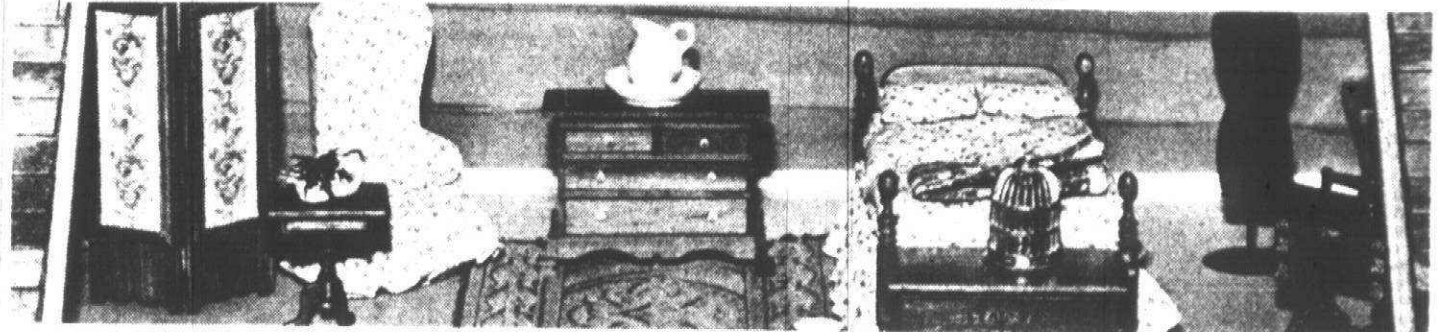
Ms. Pinkerton suggested that those concerned about obtaining an area shelter for abused women contact their county commissioner about the building in the Westland hospital complex.

Women generally are marrying later and working longer, and owe themselves educational training and career planning in order to get well-paying jobs which they will enjoy, according to a Michigan State University economist.

"A career is not an ad-hoc experience for a woman," said Collette Moser, who teaches a credit course in "Women and Work" at MSU.

"A never-married woman is likely to work for more than 40 years, longer than the average man," she said. "A married woman with children generally spends 30 to 35 years in the labor force. Almost half of all children in the country have working mothers."

Ms. Moser cited November 1977 figures from the Bureau of Labor Statistics showing that by mid-1977 there were 40 million women in the U.S. labor force, and they made up 41 per cent of the total force, and 49 per cent of the population of American women 16 years of age and over.

BUT, DESPITE the laws for equal employment and equal pay and the

strong thrust of the women's liberation movement, Ms. Moser said, women continue to be paid substantially less than men. The low pay stems from the women working primarily in clerical and service jobs which have always paid badly. The large pool of available women workers for such work further depresses their wages.

Rather than diminishing in numbers, the MSU professor said, women in clerical and service employment are expected to increase in the next decade, with more and more young women entering fields already employing large numbers of women.

Ms. Moser's course in "Woman and Work" is part of the Women's Studies Thematic Program for which MSU offers certification in addition to degrees in academic fields.

The course is part of the Public Affairs Management program within the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, in which she has the rank of assistant professor. She will teach the course in spring term at the Birmingham Center for Continuing Education.

### Late bloomers?

Life doesn't stop after age 60. Ruth Gordon received an Oscar nomination at the age of 60, and won an Academy Award for supporting

actress in "Rosemary's Baby" at 72. Maggie Kuhn organized the Gray Panthers in 1970 at age 64, and four years later, Millicent Fenwick, then

# Scientists have crib death clue

University of Michigan scientists believe they have a clue to the cause of crib death.

It appears to be a possible hypersensitivity reaction," evidenced by the presence of antibodies (IgG) in lung tissue of infants who had gone to sleep only to be discovered lifeless an hour or more later.

Medically described as Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), its victims expire of unknown, non-accidental causes. The syndrome is defined as the sudden death of any infant or young child, which is unexpected by the baby's history, and in which a thorough post-mortem examination fails to demonstrate an adequate cause.

Many infants die suddenly, unexpectedly, and shockingly from suffocation, brain injury, or swallowing a foreign object. They do not always succumb in their cribs, but sometimes fall from them, collapse while playing, or choke.

It is the non-identifiable, non-accidental, abrupt death of an infant that has puzzled medical examiners and plagued parents.

**THE SIGNIFICANCE** of the U-M study is the discovery of antibodies in lung tissues of non-traumatic deaths. Children dying suddenly from accident, a fall, or injury do not show antibodies on autopsy.

Of the 1,000 SIDS victims studied and on record with the Wayne County

Medical Examiners Office, as many as 60 per cent were reported as having had "colds" for several days prior to death.

"Three-quarters of all SIDS deaths were attributed to disease of the respiratory system, with a majority evidencing interstitial pneumonitis," a recent report states.

The study was a cooperative effort between the examiners office and the U-M School of Public Health Department of Epidemiology. Results were recently released in the January 1978 issue of the Journal of Forensic Medicine.

Investigators included Nick H. Mavarakis, Ph.D., assistant professor; Warren E. Eveland, Ph.D., professor emeritus; and W. Wilbur Ackermann, Ph.D., professor, all of the U-M.

Dr. Clara Raven, former deputy chief medical examiner of Wayne County and noted authority on SIDS, was a principal in the study.

"The findings indicate some consistent and therefore essential pathologic process in the lung that must relate (indirectly or directly) to the lethal malfunction of the lung," the report states. It was the discovery of IgG antibody that certified the suspected malfunction.

Prof. Ackermann explains that antibodies are produced as a defense against some disease agent called antigen. Although the scientists have yet to identify the specific cause, existence of antibodies prove "it" is there.

"There is limited evidence for respiratory viral antigen," the report states.

**ANTIGENS**, sometimes also called allergens, cause allergic reactions of varying intensities in individuals. All people have a built-in defense, or immunizing, system which provokes the protective production of antibodies. However, there are different degrees of provocation, sensitivity, reaction, and levels of antibodies, which might be good or bad.

Infants who died suddenly of unknown, non-traumatic causes, and in whose tissues antibodies were discovered, appeared to be particularly sensitive to the antigen(s) that challenged their immune systems.

The "antibody clue" to SIDS deaths is reinforced by epidemiological evidence which forms a pattern among its victims:

•SIDS is almost three times higher among nonwhites.

•Males predominate among victims of SIDS.

•One-third of nonwhites and one-fifth of white SIDS babies were premature.

•Maternal ages were lower than normal, and risk of SIDS decreased with increasing maternal age.

•SIDS infants weighed less than normal.

•The number of SIDS victims dying during weekends was excessive.

The study further documents that the syndrome is more prevalent in the "nonwhite socially deprived community," where there are such high-risk factors as illegitimacy, inadequate nutrition, ill health, poor medical care, smoking, drugs, and noxious agents.

"The incidence of SIDS deaths was higher in the central portion of Detroit and decreased peripherally," the report states. "The epidemiologic characteristics of SIDS in Wayne County population are essentially the same as those reported for other communities."

But it would have been interesting to have Bob around here for his high school years. Right, Coach?

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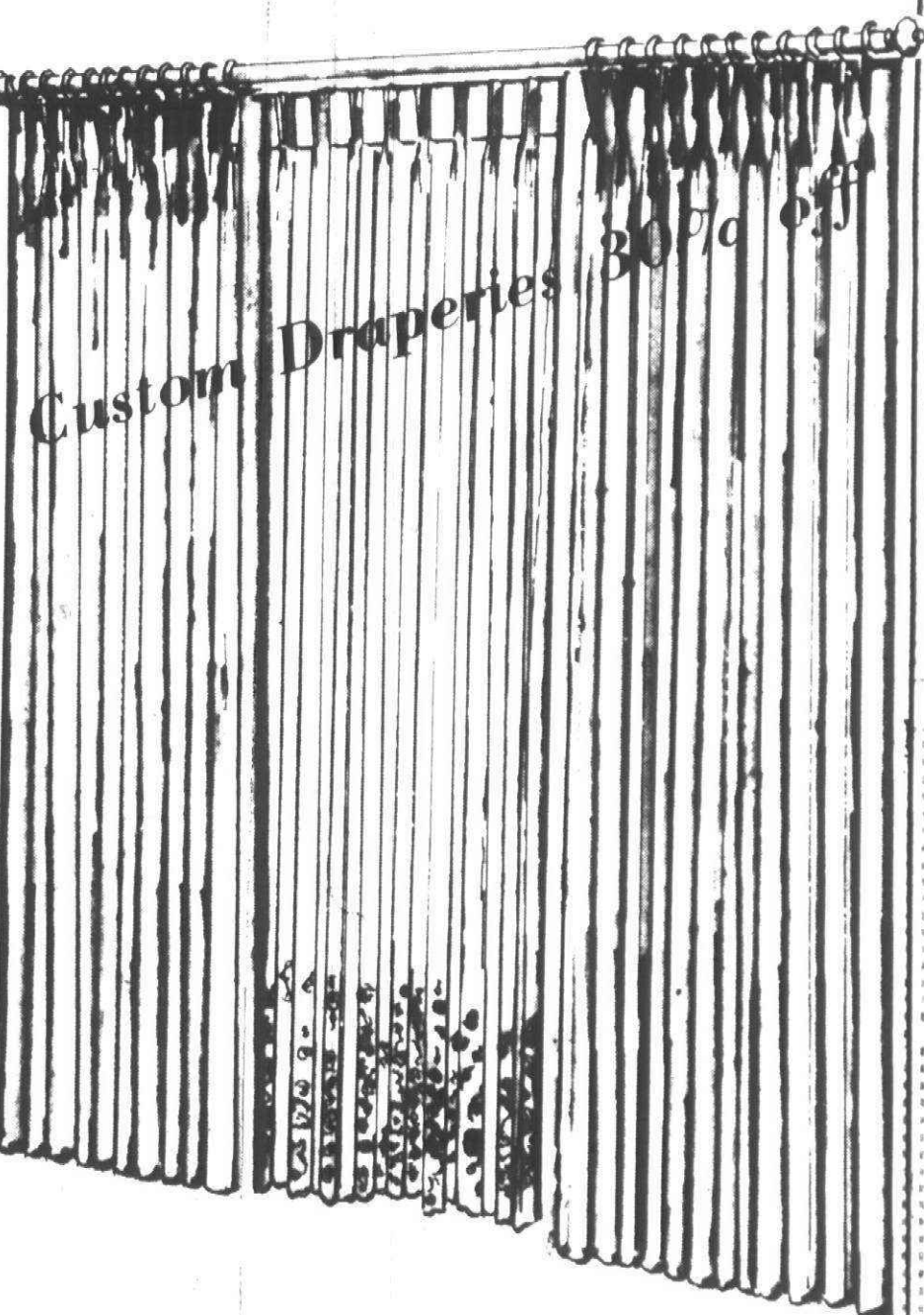

## Mason, brick shortage spell double trouble

The coal shortage that plagued our neighboring states all winter has deposited its residue on Michigan's building industry.

Across the tri-county area, developed subdivisions with almost completed houses stand unbricked.

"There's been a tremendous shortage of brick since the building boom last year," said a salesman from Kurtz Brick Co. in Livonia.

Most of Michigan's brick is made from clay in Ohio, Indiana and Iowa through a high heat firing process. The fuel stricken states, hindered by production cut backs, are responsible for our dwindling supplies.

"The (brick) plants are operating at capacity now, but they can't keep up with the demand," Kurtz officials said.

Brick is sold in units of 1,000. Builders claim prices increased 20 per cent over last year. Depending on the quality, bricks range from \$140 to \$500 per thousand.

"Once a builder can secure a sufficient brick supply, he is burdened with locating a qualified mason to lay it."

Stock piles of brick in front of otherwise completed houses are a familiar sight around southeastern Michigan.

SO WHAT'S happened to all the masons?

"Since the 1974-75 recession, many masons left the business and went to Ford and other companies and didn't come back," said Richard Scwab, president of Great Lakes Homes in Farmington Hills.

Mason shortages are partially responsible for the three-month delays Great Lakes has experienced in delivering their finished house to the consumer.

Scwab's company builds houses in Rochester and sections of Macomb County. A qualified mason may demand 30 per cent more for his labor this year than he did in 1976, he said.

A mason averages \$200 per thousand bricks he lays, Scwab said.

"The mason shortages are very serious, we have many houses completely finished on the inside but no brick," said George Torrente, president of Galaxy Homes, a home builder

in Troy, West Bloomfield, Sterling Heights and Avon Township.

"The results is the customer can't move into the home. There's no closing, so we can't pay the contractor. Last year, we had the same problem," Torrente said.

The average home in West Bloomfield, for example, requires 30,000 to 35,000 bricks, and masonry crews dictate the time spent on each job.

"No two crews are alike. The man hours depend on the individuals themselves. A crew of three brothers, who split the profits, may lay 3,000 in one day."

"A mason being paid by the hour may only lay 700 in a day," Torrente said.

EMPLOYERS UNWILLINGNESS to hire mason apprentices is another cause for the masonry shortage, said Louis Scheich of the Mason Contractors Association.

The association has 51 apprentices, but the contractors don't want to bother training them, he claimed. There are 1,000 journeymen masons in the tri-county area.

Three weeks of practical training and three-years of on-the-job training plus two weeks of night school in the winter comprise the apprenticeship program.

If they get jobs, the men are paid \$8.52 per hour including benefits for the first six months then a five per cent increase every six months. At the end of three years, they earn \$11.96 per hour.

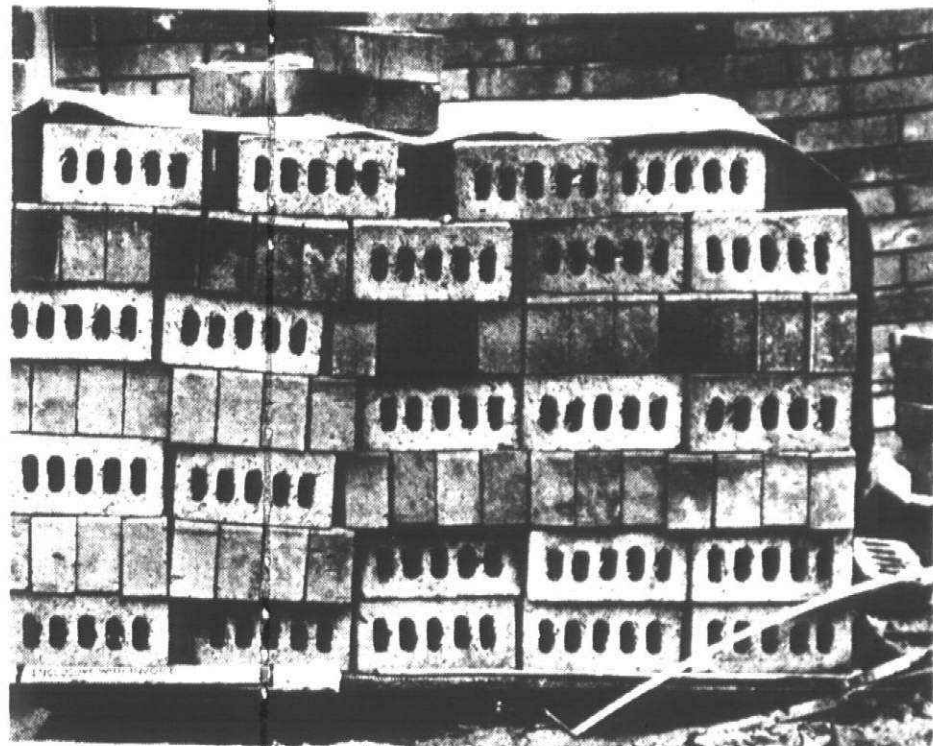
As journeymen, they start at a base wage of \$11.56 plus fringe benefits.

Mother Nature has bitten many hands this season contributing to the building slow down. Local building codes require temperatures to be above freezing and the sky to be sunny in order for the masons to work, due to the calcium chloride in the mortar mix.

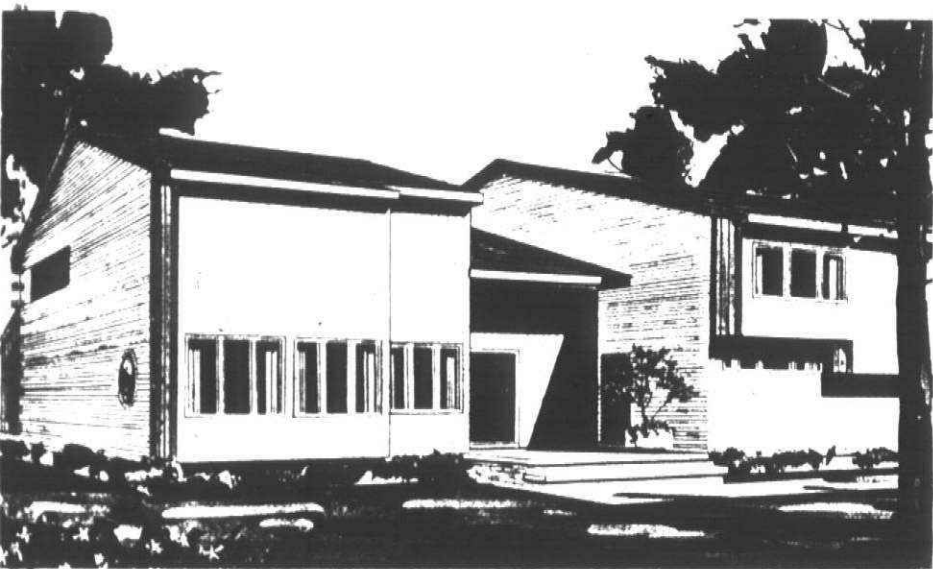
When the temperature dips below freezing, as it did most of this winter, the mortar mix doesn't harden adequately and eventually crumbles.

The house cost burden runs the gamut of passes for a panorama of reasons. Like everything else, the buck stops with the consumer.

"Absolutely, the consumer has to expect to pay more with all these problems," Scwab said.

## Cedar siding becomes popular

Trends and energy efficiency appear to be paving the walks to brickless homes.

"We've almost eliminated the use of brick on our houses," said Toby Holtzman, partner of Holtzman & Silverman builders in Southfield.

Originally, the Midwest was the home of brick homes, the builder adds, but rising costs and the unavailability of bricks and masons has opened doors for building with other materials.

Cedar shakes and aluminum siding have replaced the traditional brick exteriors.

"It's faster to build without brick. We can put siding on in one day, we can't do that with brick," Holtzman said.

Wood covers are more energy efficient than brick siding, the builder said, because bricks conduct cold and wood doesn't—this saves the homeowner money in heating bills.

A brickless development on the outskirts of Ann Arbor is a new Holtzman and Silverman project.

The houses, ranging from \$60,000-\$90,000, are encased with cedar shakes in the Cape Cod design.

"This is a trend (brickless homes), and we don't stop it. We knew a long time ago this trend was on the way, and we're quite satisfied with it," Holtzman said.

ONLY THE FIREPLACE is brick in a Pulte house, said Michael Moore, vice-president and construction manager of the company.

The \$50,000-\$80,000 houses in West Bloomfield, Troy, Rochester, Farmington, Chesterfield and Canton townships have aluminum exteriors, with a few models having partial brick fronts.

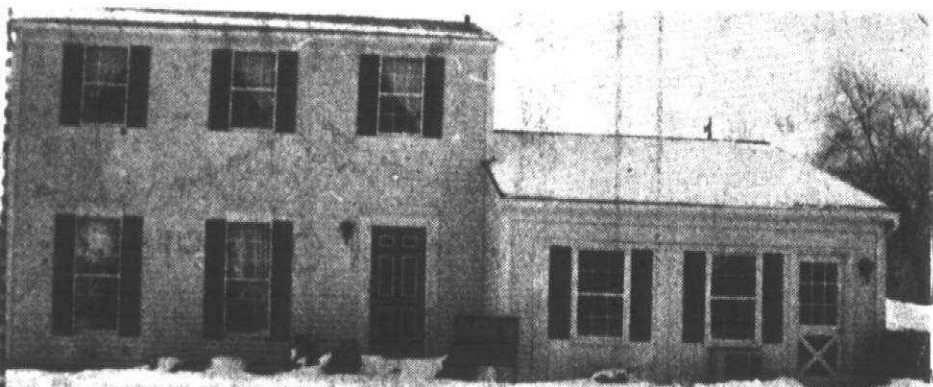
Housing trends begin in California, said Abbey Homes advertising director Michele Burkli. "California has been using cedar shakes for quite a few years, and we picked up the idea for our contemporary homes."

A two-story front foyer with bubble windows are innovations in housing. Abbey Homes offers greenhouse windows over the kitchen sinks and a planter in the two-story foyer that can be watered from a faucet in a nearby closet.

"Our homes have wood siding because wood is more heat efficient than aluminum," Burkli said. "Skylights are a feature, but fireplaces and wet bars are a must."

Abbey custom houses in West Bloomfield and Bloomfield Hills are priced from \$170,000 to \$600,000 for one-acre to 1 1/2-acre prime lots.

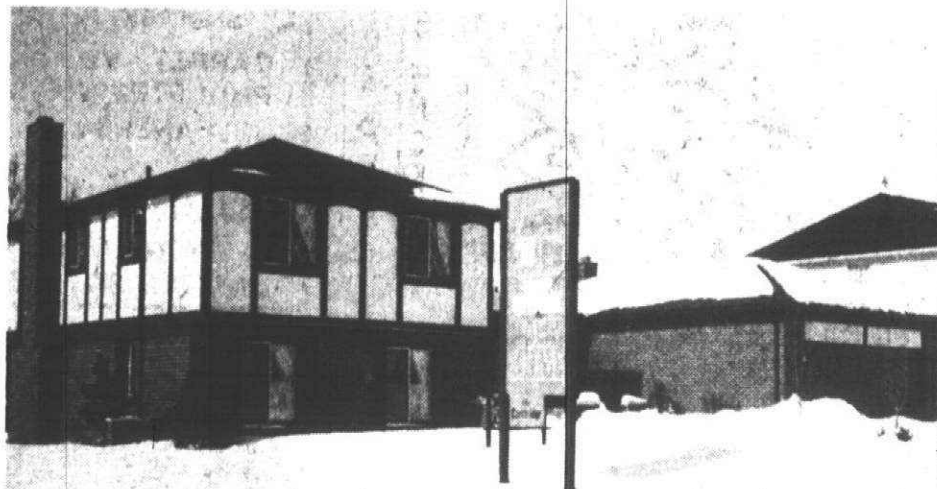

## Checklist provides aid on moving day

Here are some valuable moving tips from the South Oakland County Board of Realtors.

• Map out a timetable of all things that must be done before moving day. A day-by-day calendar is a convenient way to keep track of all the details.

At one time, it was believed that a new home buyer could afford to buy a home equal to two to 2 1/2 times the family income.

That meant a family with a \$15,000 yearly income could afford to buy a home priced between \$30,000 and \$37,500.

But the South Oakland County Board of Realtors advises that this axiom only serves as a guide and does not consider individual circumstances. Factors such as down payments and monthly home payments (including principal, interest, taxes and insurance) are variables.

The booklet's tables provide answers to home prices and buying power based on 30-year loan with 20 per cent down, common loan terms in many sections of the nation.

At a 9.5 per cent interest rate, for example, a family with a \$15,000 income should be able to handle monthly payments of \$310, according to the table, and afford a home rang-

ing in price from \$33,000-\$36,000. A down payment of \$6,800 would be required.

At lower interest rates, the same family should be able to afford a slightly more expensive home.

The board of realtors says that by increasing the down payment, more expensive homes become affordable.

But many mortgages don't require such a high down payment on the house. There are many mortgages available with only a five per cent down payment.

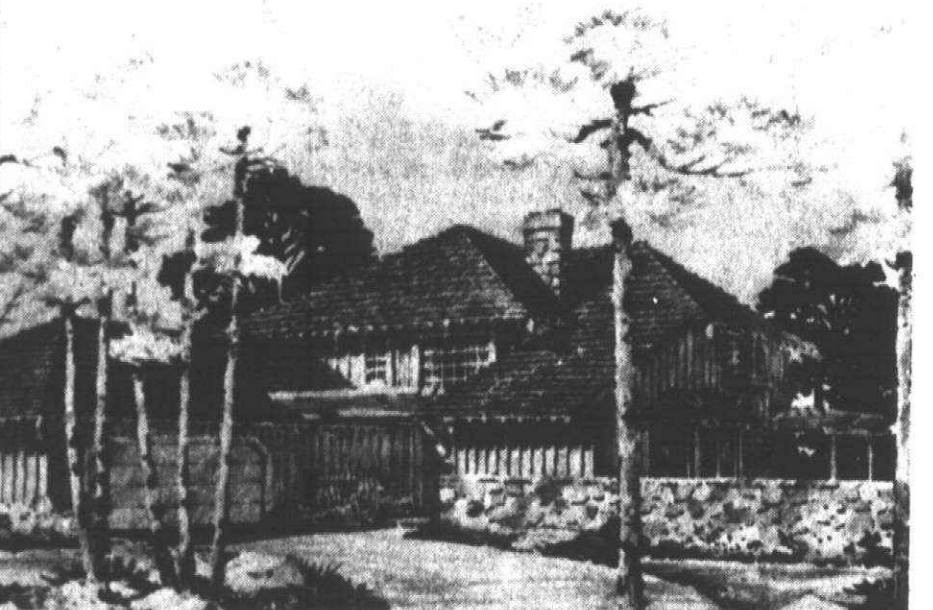

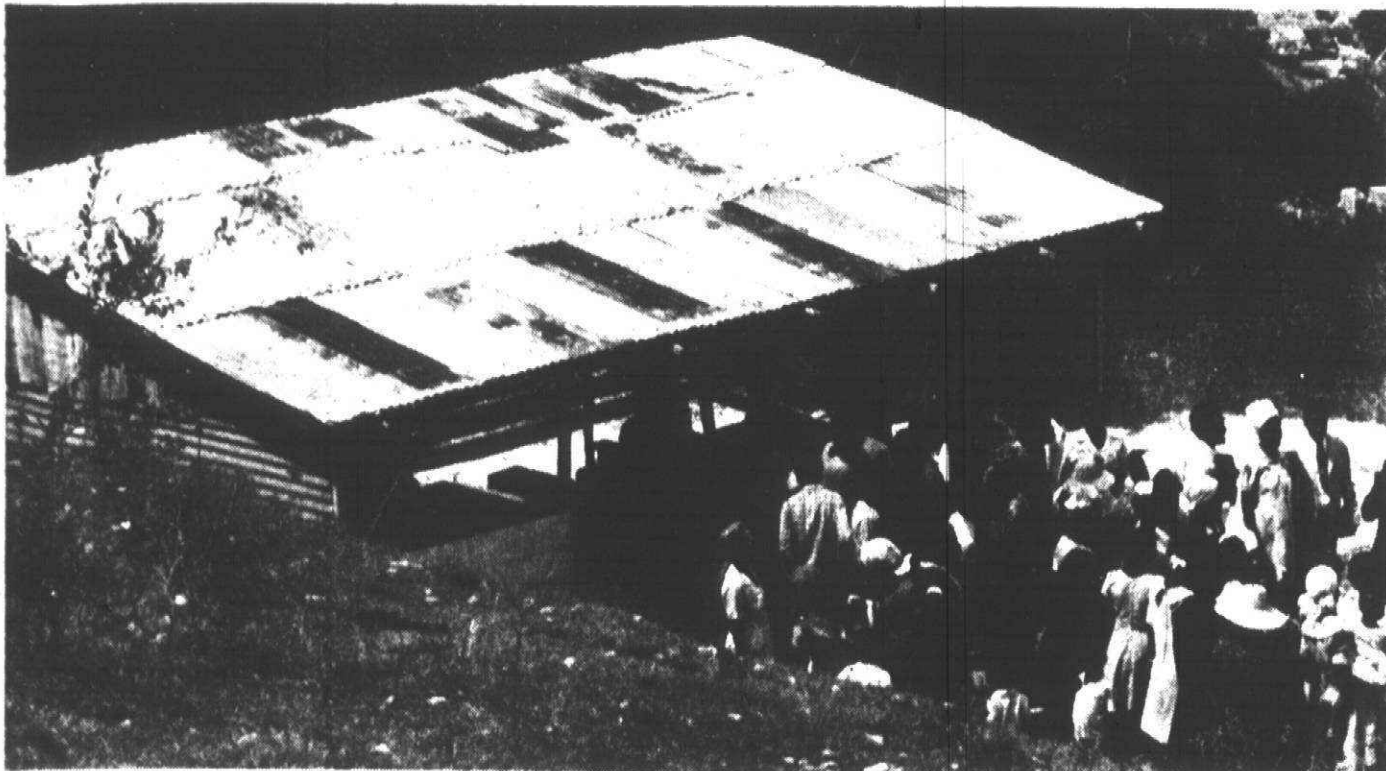

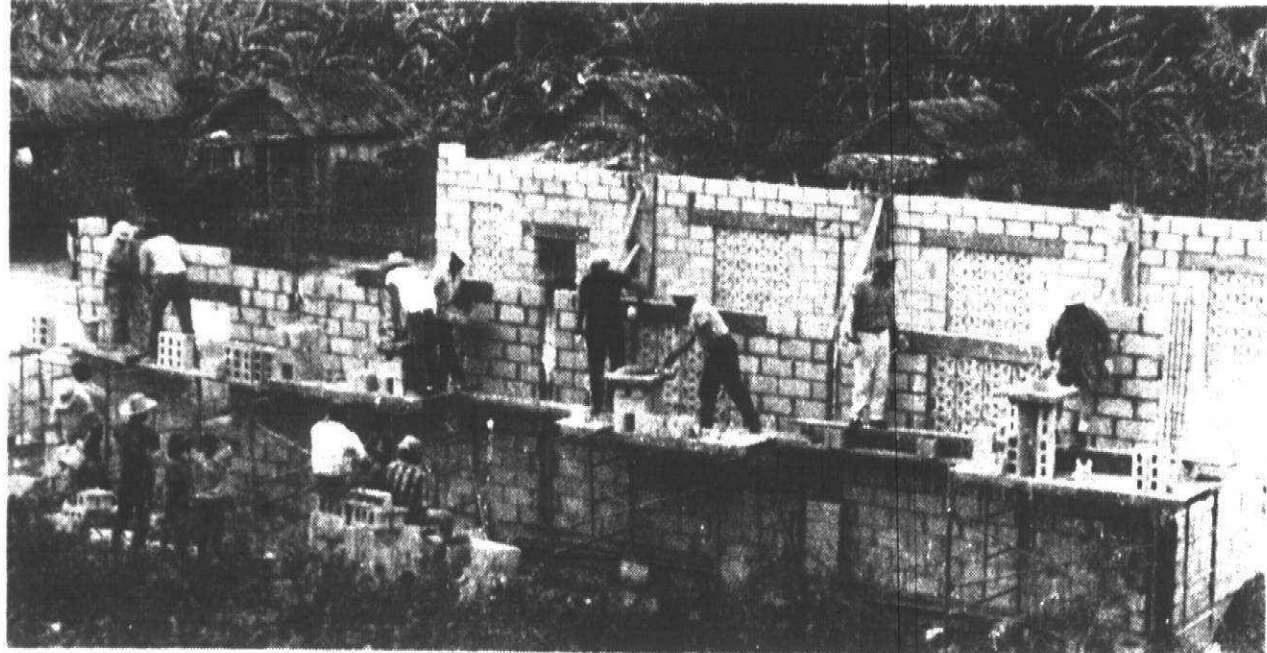

# Plymouth Nazarene members build in Haiti

A new church in the countryside of the Caribbean island of Haiti has some roots with the Plymouth Church of the Nazarene.

Twenty-one men from the congregation, led by pastor Rev. Carl Allen, spent two weeks among the Haitian palm trees in a rural area about 30 miles from the city of Port-au-Prince to help build the new structure.

To say it is a cement block building with steel trusses and a corrugated metal roof is to tell only a small portion of the story.

The rest of the tale concerns the men willing to leave families and jobs to bring a new church to life, a distant Church of the Nazarene congregation. It replaced an old shed-like structure open on the sides.

Before leaving, the men experienced the accomplishment, as Rev. Allen dedicated the church with a message to about 500 Haitians.

"We instigated the project by contacting our World Missions Department in Kansas City," explained Allen. "We expressed an interest in organizing a group of men to go to some country to build a church."

Eventually it was worked out that the Plymouth church would contribute \$5,000 toward building supplies, and the men would donate \$500 each for their own expenses.

THE MEN LEFT Metro Airport in February temperatures of 20 degrees. For their two week stay in Haiti, the mercury lingered at about 90 degrees. "We took all our own food, tools, medicine and household needs plus the

supplies we were donating," said the pastor. "We also took additional medicine to give to the clinic. In all, with our suitcases and boxes, we had 64 pieces of luggage."

"We lived in tents or in the local pastor's home, and did our own cooking on a gas stove we brought with us."

"I got up at 4:30 a.m. to direct the cooking and to have breakfast ready by 5 a.m.," Rev. Allen said. "We worked until about noon. Then sometimes we went to the ocean. Afternoon hours were from 3:30 p.m. to about 5 and 6 p.m."

The building's foundation was already laid by the time the men arrived. They went to work putting up the walls and ceiling. They also built pews. Robert Yeager of Westland, a carpenter by trade, was construction supervisor. However, none of the other men had building experience.

The men worked with Haitians. "They spoke Creole," Rev. Allen said, "although the official language of the country is French. I felt we had a warm, close relationship with the people. They came at devotional time and would sing. They weren't bashful and got very involved."

Pastor Allen noted that the Haitians were enthusiastic.

"Their income is low, but they are willing to work," he said. "To build the church, the women had to carry water half a mile to the barrels which held it until it was used to mix mortar or cement."

JIM WATSON of Plymouth, vice-president of the Indiana Sunday Sales Co., said he was impressed with the Haitian families.

"They (the children) were extremely well-behaved and there didn't seem to be a feeling of animosity between family members," he said. "There was no arguing, pushing or shoving that goes on in families here."

"The women were always working. They carried their water from the spring to do their washing and cleaning. Their tools were quite primitive. They would pound roots with a stick to make a powder."

"The men seemed to disappear in (Continued on page 7B)

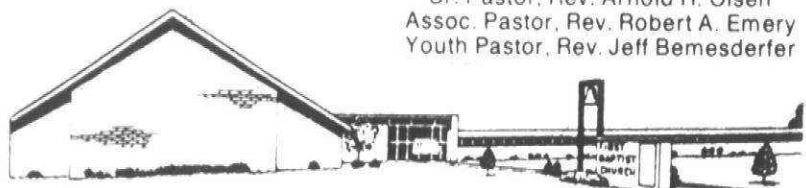

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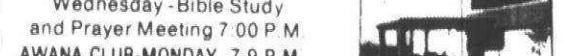

the daytime. I don't know where they went. There was little employment for them."

Watson said despite the simple life in the country, the people seemed satisfied.

"They lived in extreme poverty, yet they were happy," he said. "I think it has to do with their lifestyle. They live a very dependent, family oriented tribal life. They depend for survival on each other."

Watson said 95 per cent of the Haitians in the rural area the men visited, "are voo-doo oriented." Nearly 70 per cent belonged to the Nazarene church, he added.

"It is very difficult when conversing with them to know whether they are Christians or not."

One of the northern visitors, Dr. Neal Belgiano, spent most of his time visiting and working in the various medical facilities in the vicinity. A

resident in internal medicine at Boston Hospital, he was given two weeks off with pay by the hospital.

"They felt that the experience was a valuable contribution to his medical training," Allen said. "He was able to visit the director of the General Hospital at Port-au-Prince. It opened the door to allow our church to send in medical supplies."

"Pharmaceutical companies had made donations, but couldn't get them in the country. It now appears we can send them in."

The men returned with "a greater vision for World Missions," the pastor said. They were met at the airport by about 60 friends and relatives carrying a welcoming banner.

"We returned with a great sense of gratitude for the blessings we enjoy in the U.S.," he continued. "The salary in Haiti is about \$200 a year."

"I feel this trip is one of the greatest things that has happened to our local church."

### Aldersgate tops goal to save homes

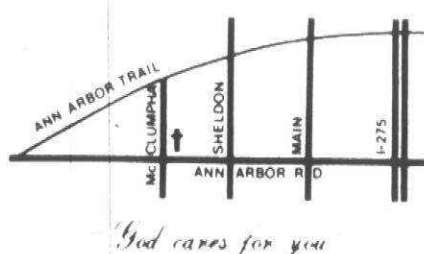

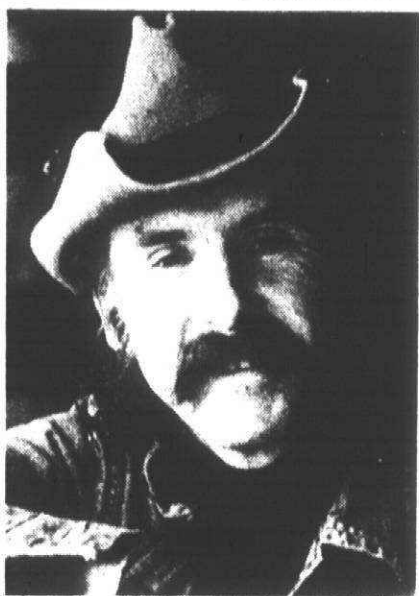
A folk concert Friday night at the University of Michigan-Dearborn is billed as guaranteed to reach "both your heart and funnybone with awe-some precision."

This is not to say that Nina is a good copy of some of the better female artists of our time... she is a very talented woman who uses these attributes to further enhance her own style."

# Eli cops area cage honor

After what could be phrased as a below-average season record-wise in 1976-77, the 14 Observer-area basketball teams rebounded this year and proved to be some of the toughest squads in the state.

In this area, 10 of the 14 teams finished the regular season with better than .500 records, and three of the squads won district titles in Class 'A' tournament competition.

Plymouth Salem finished with the best regular season record for the second-straight season with a 18-2 mark. The Rocks shared the Suburban Eight League championship with Livonia Bentley, marking the fifth-straight season they have earned the title. Salem also won the Southfield District.

Westland John Glenn had a great season, advancing further than any Observer team in the tourney. Glenn, champions of the Northwest Suburban League, won the Livonia Churchill District and defeated Salem in regional action before bowing to Detroit Mackenzie in the regional finals.

Redford Bishop Borgess was the third Observer-area district champion, capturing the Ferndale crown. Borgess also competed in the Catholic

League playoffs and finished second to Detroit Catholic Central in First Division Central competition.

Along with excellent team play, the Observer-area was also blessed with fine, individual talent this season. A number of brother combinations highlighted the action led by the Decosters from Borgess and the Halls from Livonia Stevenson.

In one of the toughest meetings in years, area coaches recently met to pick their All-Observer cage team.

Here are the results of that meeting:

### FIRST TEAM

**Daran Armstrong, junior, Westland John Glenn.** The 5-11, 150-pound guard was the leading vote-getter this season impressing many coaches with his spark and leadership in the tourney. The Rockets' leading scorer (17.0 point average), leading assist man (7.0), and leader in steals (3.0), Armstrong proved he was an outstanding team player and unselfish cager.

"Daran is an outstanding passer and penetrator," said Glenn coach Gordon Davis. "He uses his quickness well on defense."

Armstrong was a first-team All-Northwest Suburban League pick in his sophomore and junior years. He is

the second leading all-time scorer and assister in Glenn basketball history with one year to go.

**Tom Ellinghausen, senior, Plymouth Salem.** This is the second straight season the 6-4½ forward has landed a spot on the first-team All-Observer squad. He has led the Rocks in scoring and rebounding over the last two seasons averaging over 19 points and 10 caroms this year.

The Rocks' co-captain, a fifth-team All-State selection, finished his three-year varsity career as the second leading scorer and rebounder in the school's history behind his 1976 All-State brother Jim Ellinghausen. Tom broke one of Jim's records this season, collecting 22 rebounds against Southfield in the district finale.

"Tom has an excellent head for the game and was a key scorer in defense of the league championship," said Salem coach Fred Thomann. Ellinghausen was an All-Suburban Eight League selection for the second-straight season.

**Mike Petsch, senior, Redford Union.** First-team Observer-area honors have become a habit for this all-around athlete. The 6-5, 210 pounder, who also excels in football and track, is another

All-Suburban Eight League selection in basketball. He was the heart of Carl Andrews' squad this season, averaging a whopping 26.0 points and 16.2 rebounds per game—tops in the league and area.

Petsch, the second leading scorer in the school's long history, connected for over 30 points per game on eight different occasions this year. He also had nine games with 20 or more rebounds.

Headed for the University of Michigan on a football scholarship, Petsch also claimed the state crown in the shot put last year.

**Dave Decoster, senior, Redford Bishop Borgess.** The bigger of the Decoster twins, Dave is a 6-7, 195-pound forward who grabbed All-Catholic, All-Metro, and All-State honors along with the Observer-area selection.

The four-year varsity starter compiled over 1,000 points in his high school career and is the school's all-time leading scorer and rebounder. He has led the Spartans to two consecutive district titles in the past two seasons along with a combined record of 32-12.

"Dave is an excellent jump shooter and driver," said Borgess coach Ron (Continued on page 2C)

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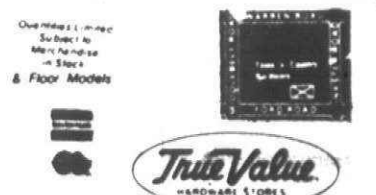

Bill Peterson, senior, Livonia-Clarenceville. The 6-5, 200-pound center has been the mainstay of the Trojan program over the past three years. He holds the school record for most points and rebounds in his career and also holds the all-time record for most points scored in a single season.

The three-year varsity letter winner has always been in the starting line up during that span. The well-rounded player was strong inside but also shot at an impressive 59 per cent clip from the outside during his career.

"Bill has improved each of his three years and still has not reached his total potential," said Clarenceville coach Bob Wolf. "He has been just a tremendous asset to our program as a player and off the court."

The All-Metro West League first-teamer averaged 22.6 points and 12.5 rebounds this season.

## SECOND TEAM

Rich Hewlett, junior, Plymouth Salem. The sixth player selected by the coaches was an All-State quarterback. But don't be fooled—Hewlett is an excellent basketball player as well.

The six-foot guard was the Rocks' second-leading scorer this season with over 12 points per game. He was the leading assist man and second leading rebounder for Salem enroute to a second-team All-Suburban Eight League selection for the second-straight year.

"Rich is an excellent defensive player and made many game breaking plays in many victories," said Thorman.

Hewlett played varsity basketball as a freshman.

Harold 'Butch' King, junior, Plymouth Canton. The All-Western Six League selection has one of the best outside shots in the area, causing many teams to play special defenses to stop him. The 6-1, 170-pound guard led the Chiefs in scoring with a 21.3 average and scored 43 points in one game this year.

Thorderson is a top-notch student as well, compiling a 3.8 grade point average. He is an outstanding leader on and off the court.

Dave Hall, sophomore, Livonia Stevenson. Hall was the only sophomore selected on the All-Observer squad showing the potential this 6-3, 180-pound forward possesses. He was the Spartans' leading scorer with 309 points and broke a school record with 320 rebounds. He blocked 76 shots and was second on the team in steals.

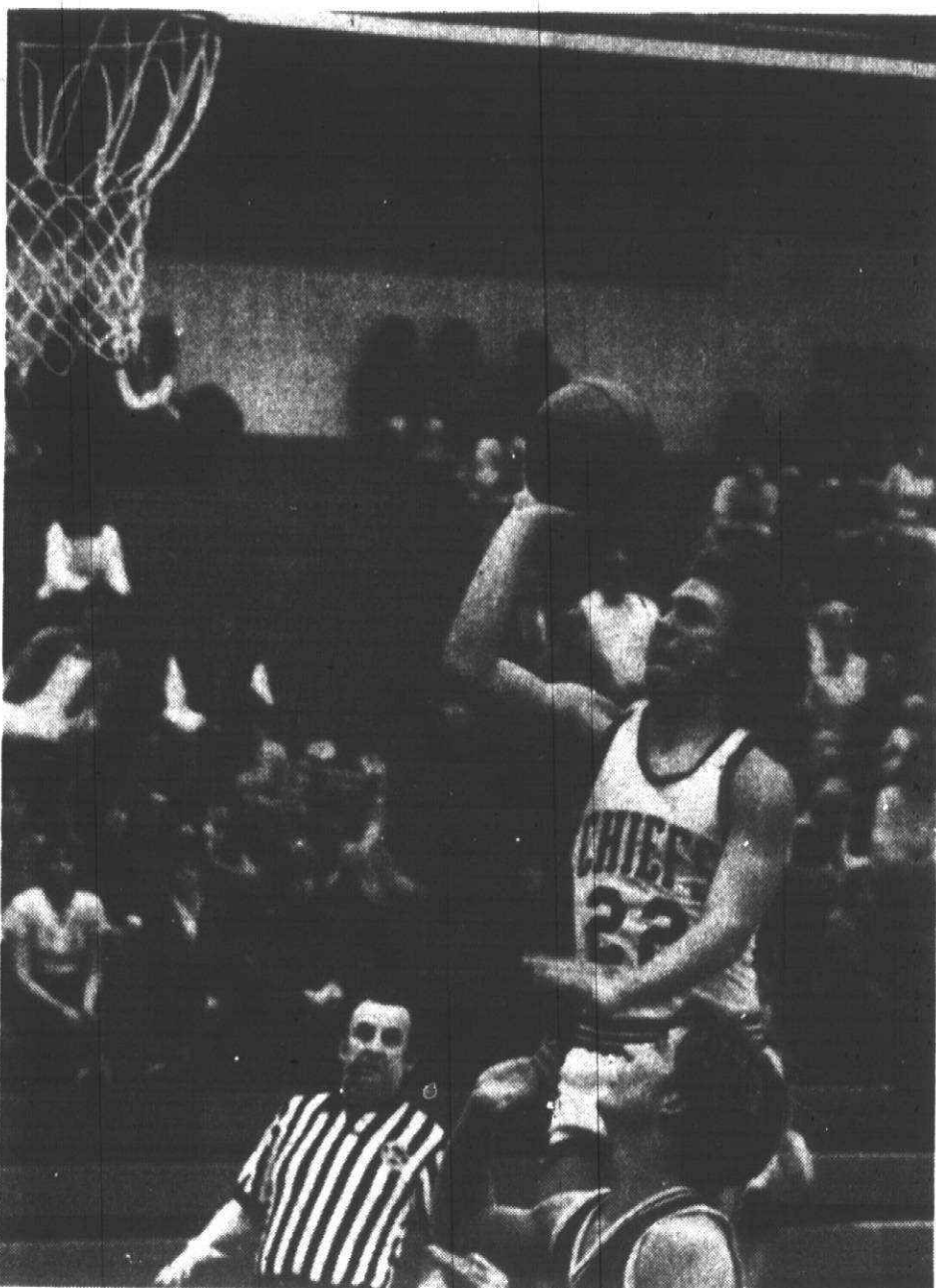
An all-around athlete, Hall played varsity football last fall as a quarterback and also high jumps in track.

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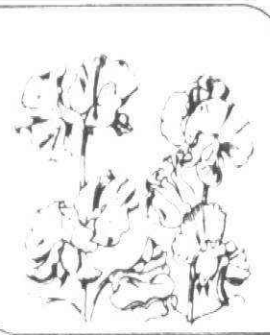
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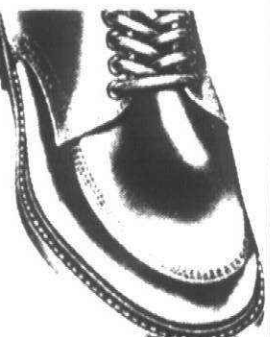

**Dan Decoster, senior, Redford Bishop Borgess.** The other Borgess twin, a 6-4, 185-pound swing man is also a top college prospect, gaining All-Catholic and All-Metro honors. He averaged 16 points, 10 rebounds and four assists per game, playing both forward and guard.
