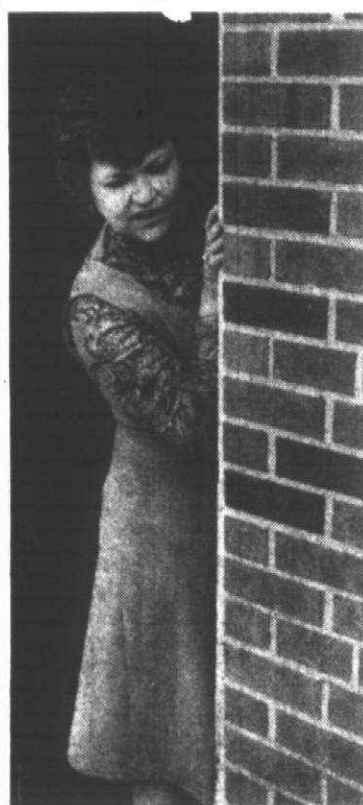

Township man acquitted of murder

A jury acquitted Robert E. Little Tuesday on all three charges stemming from his Dec. 19 arrest for the murder of a Romulus man.

Little was released after spending almost four months in jail to go home to his parents in Canton's Royal Holiday Mobile Home Park.

Little, 21, was picked up by Wayne County detectives within hours of shooting death of Roger Hogan, 25, of Romulus.

Wayne County Det. Frank Burton said Hogan's girlfriend identified

Little as the man who shot her boyfriend five times in the basement of their home and then came upstairs to fire a shot at her. Police said Little had visited her and Hogan earlier that evening, left, and returned just before 11 p.m. asking to look at stereo equipment Hogan was selling.

The trial boiled down to Jeannette "Bootsy" Costa's statement that she recognized Little as the assailant versus Little's testimony that he was home sleeping when the murder occurred.

After deliberating almost three

hours, the jury delivered a not guilty verdict Tuesday at 11:40 a.m. to Wayne County Circuit Judge Joseph B. Sullivan.

Little said yesterday that Ms. Costa may have harbored a grudge against him because he would often go out evenings with Hogan to "pick up chicks."

"Roger had a problem with drugs. PCP, things like that," Little said. "Then when he'd come home all messed up, she blamed me."

Little mentioned that Hogan's father, Roark "Tex" Hogan, a con-

victed drug dealer, was due to be released from federal prison April 11.

Little said he lived at the Romulus address with Hogan, Ms. Costa and others in 1973 but left to "clean up my act."

"I'm not denying it," Little said. "I used to be pretty heavy into drugs. But I cleaned up my act. I started going to college studying criminal justice."

Police sources say Little had served as an informant for the Wayne County Metro Squad and the Downriver Association of Narcotics Officers (DRANO).

"As far as being an informant or anything, I wouldn't want to say anything for publication," Little said Wednesday.

Asked how it felt to be acquitted and out of jail after nearly four months, Little said, "I feel like the world's been lifted off my shoulders."

The three charges Little was acquitted on were first degree murder in the death of Hogan; assault with intent to commit murder for allegedly shooting at Ms. Costa; and possession of a firearm in commission of a felony.

No pistol was produced as evidence by police during the trial.

Stein, Myers at odds

A defeated ordinance that would have protected mobile home park tenants in Canton is the center of a political dispute between two township officials.

Supervisor Harold Stein and Trustee Robert Myers remain at odds over an ordinance Myers proposed that would have prevented mobile home park owners from setting a minimum sale price for trailers sold by tenants. Canton officials rejected the ordinance last month on the advice of township attorney Walter Guth.

Tenants at the Royal Holiday Mobile Home Park in Canton have been concerned that park owner Sheldon Futernick may deny them the right to sell their trailer on the lot they rent. Futernick has said establishment of a \$10,000 minimum sale price for tenants selling their units on the park site would eliminate substandard units and preserve the park's property values.

But Mary Woods, president of the park tenants' association, says Futernick's real reason for setting a minimum sale price is because he also sells new and used mobile homes.

Myers' proposal, which he introduced to prevent Futernick from setting a minimum sale price, was taken from a set of rules passed by the state Mobile Home Commission (MHC) last month. The rules won't become law for at least 90 days until a series of administrative procedures must be cleared.

Myers is a member of the MHC as well as president of the Michigan Mobile Homeowners Association (MMHA).

The tenants at Royal Holiday Park have had several run-ins with Myers in the past two years over his handling of monthly dues paid to the MMHA. They have recently taken their complaints to Stein and are no longer seeking Myers' assistance, according to Mrs. Woods.

MYERS CLAIMS his proposal was turned down because Stein wants to gain support in Royal Holiday Park.

"Stein didn't want that ordinance to pass so he could take advantage of an anti-Myers sentiment in Royal Holiday," the trustee said. "Guth's opinion was not given to us in our board packet—it was handed to us just before the meeting."

"To me, this was a political move and an asinine one because while Stein was worrying about votes in Royal Holiday, he discounted 6,000 other mobile home owners in Canton."

"I'm the expert on mobile homes on the township board. Harold tried to discredit me by saying tenants don't need this kind of protection."

Stein denies Myers' charges and said the township board acted on the advice of its attorney.

"Myers is supposed to be the expert on mobile homes," the supervisor said. "Where in the hell has he been

Industrial site bought up

Following Detroit and Livonia's example, Canton Township became a major landholder Tuesday night by buying up 132 more acres in hopes of selling the land to a large industrial developer at a later date.

The move was part of township officials' recent commercial and industrial push designed to take some of the tax burden off the homeowner.

Responding to criticism that Canton's growth plans ignore school impact, Supervisor Harold Stein

invited officials from three local school districts to hear his three-pronged attack on the bedroom-community mentality.

After a slide presentation from the commercial and industrial committee, Stein announced that the township board decided last week, in closed session, to purchase a 132-acre parcel of land at Haggerty and Warren for \$800,000.

The land is owned by Metropolitan Savings and Loan Co. It was pre-

viously owned by Biltmore Estates. The parcel is zoned to permit apartment and condominium construction but officials plan to rezone it for heavy industrial use.

Only Trustee Lynne Goldsmith opposed the purchase.

The narrow parcel is located on the west side of Haggerty at the junction of Koppernick and Haggerty roads. The property extends south through a flood plain, across Warren to the south property line located about 500 feet south of Ford Road.

THE ACQUISITION will connect this land to Canton's current 78-acre industrial park on Joy and Ronda Drive.

Stein said it would be in the township's best interest to buy the land for a number of reasons.

Among them, industrial clients would now have larger lots available to them. Secondly, the area is close to C&O Railroad, just east of Mettetal Airport and has adequate water pressure, sewers and natural gas service.

The one drawback to development, Stein said, is that Haggerty is not paved in Canton and large trucks are not permitted to travel on it at present.

Haggerty, north of Joy Road, is paved and designated a class "A" road by the county which permits heavy industrial traffic.

Stein argued successfully that Can-

No April Fool, tax could drop

An unwieldy amount of cash has accumulated in Canton's general fund. That puts township administrators in the surprising position of trying to find ways to reduce the tax residents are presently paying.

And that's no belated April Fool's joke.

Finance Director Mike Gorman suggested Tuesday night that township officials consider reducing the township levy from its current 8.25 mills to 6.75 mills. The owner of a \$50,000 home in Canton would realize a \$37.50 cent reduction of the amount he presently pays for Canton services, Gorman said.

The finance director's report was discussed by board members but no action was taken. Further financial suggestions on how to reduce the operating budget will be explored.

Gorman said Canton will probably have "a little over \$1 million" in its cash reserves by the end of 1978.

To cut that surplus in half, Gorman made a number of suggestions. He recommended that the township-wide special assessment for fire depart-

ment construction be lowered one mill to a levy of 1/4 mill.

And the five mills presently being levied for the general operating budget could be lowered to 4%, Gorman said.

Gorman also recommended that the two-mill police special assessment passed last August stay the same to get the department off the ground.

The reduced millage would mean that Canton would take in approximately \$390,000 less next year, Gorman said. But that still would leave more than \$60,000 in the general fund.

Of that amount, Gorman said, \$100,000 could be applied toward the library if voters approve an upcoming one-mill special assessment to establish a local library. If voters turn down the library millage, Gorman said the \$100,000 would "further reduce the millage by 4 of a per cent."

How did Canton end up with such a sizeable lump sum in its general fund? Gorman said the money has been growing for scores of years and jumped recently because levies such as the fire assessment were overestimated.

Tear gas mishap shuts bank office

Tear gas from a malfunctioning security device wafted through a branch office of the Michigan National Bank on Sheldon near Ford Road Wednesday morning, shutting down most of the bank's operations for the day.

James Simone, district officer and assistant vice-president of Michigan National Bank, said employees accidentally triggered the security device at about 9 a.m., before the bank opened to the public.

The device malfunctioned and emitted noxious gas as employees attempted to activate the security sys-

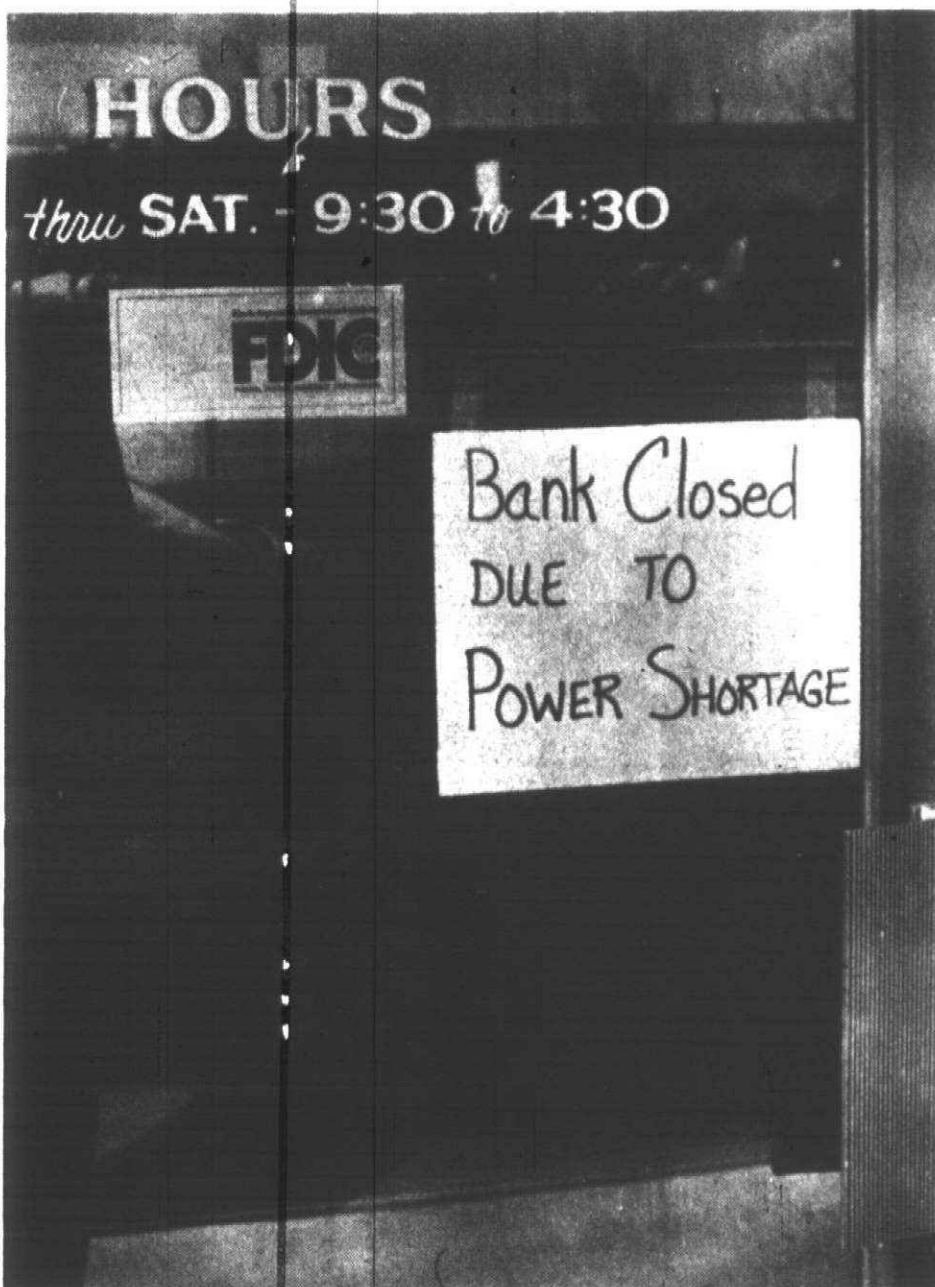
tem used during the bank's operational hours, Simone said.

No one required hospitalization because of gas inhalation, according to a spokesman for the Canton Fire Department, which supervised evacuation of the building.

Simone declined to disclose details of the accident from fear that a public statement would jeopardize the effectiveness of the bank's security system.

Many banks use a dummy valise containing tear gas and a dye to foil would-be robbers.

Simone expected the bank to be open for full business today.

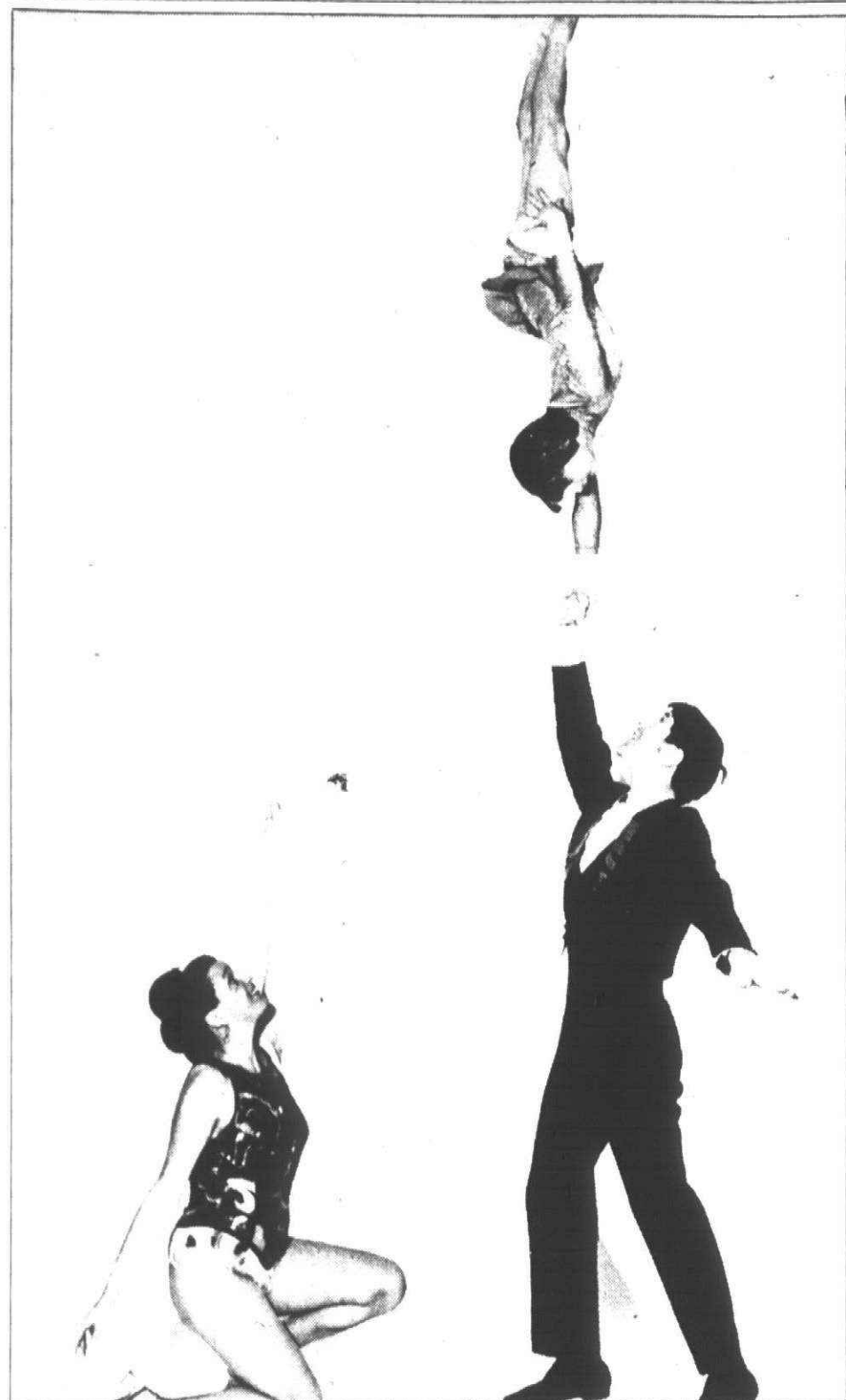

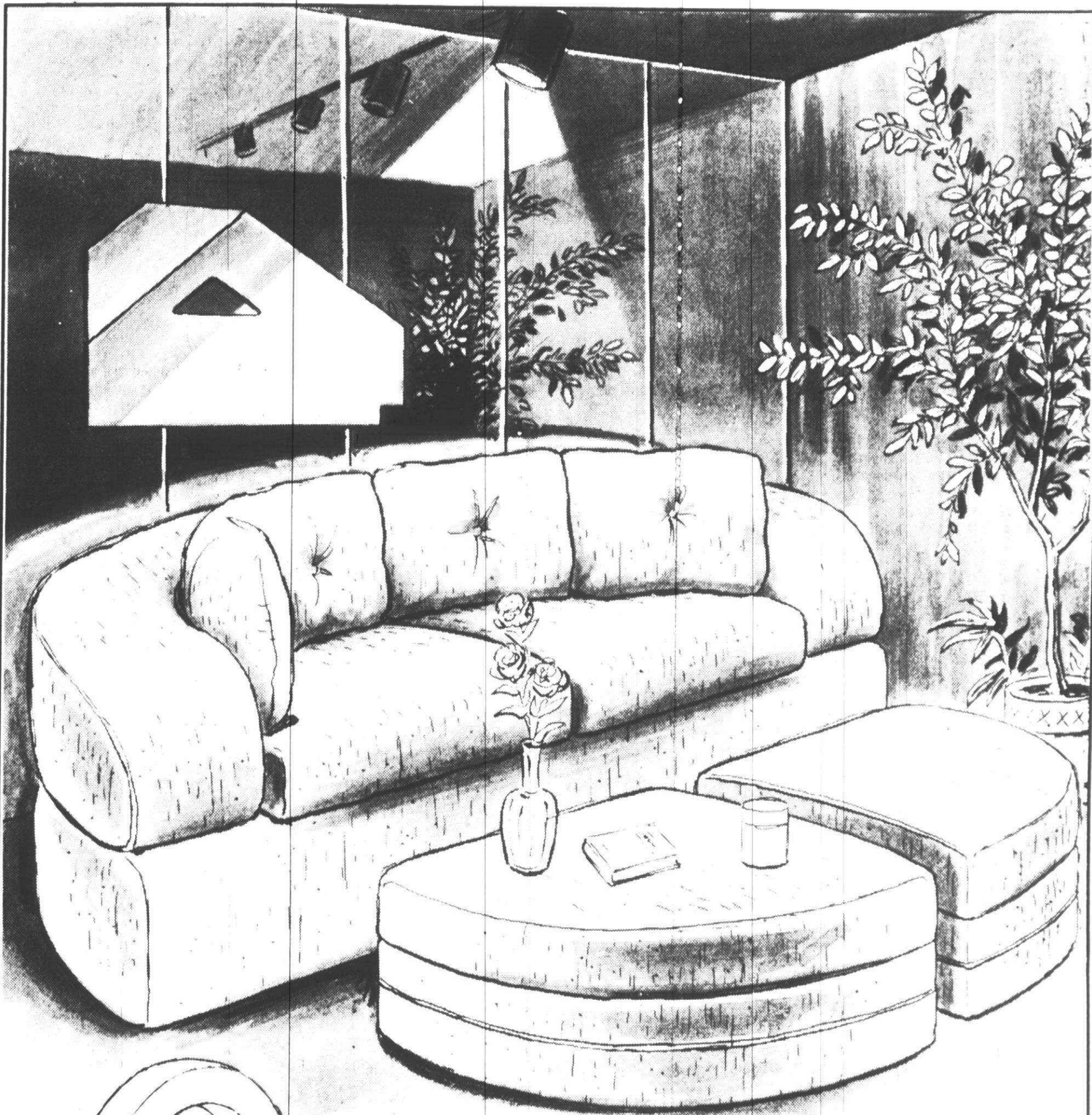

'Federal subsidy' strikes fear in suburbia

If the future of suburban communities is similar it is because the residents share many of the same fears.

This became evident again in Monday's overwhelming defeat in Birmingham of a ballot proposal to build a senior citizens apartment building.

Many of the Birmingham residents' fears were the same as those shared by Plymouthites more than a year ago when voters rejected tax abatement for senior citizen housing on the Wilcox property.

And many of the fears are likely to surface if another senior citizen project, supported with federal dollars, should come up again in Plymouth or Canton Township.

The long-term result of these fears for both cities could well be a continued trend toward an upper-middle class ghetto and the death of a community of mixed ages and mixed incomes.

A GROUP OF four churches in Birmingham organized a consortium, called Baldwin House, to build a senior citizens housing project.

The plans were to provide 150 units in a five-to-seven-story building.

Money to construct the units would come from bond sale proceeds handled by the Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA). Rent subsidies would be paid by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

An early sign of trouble in Birmingham came when HUD changed its regulations to require construction of low- and moderate-income housing for families in conjunction with an elderly housing project.

Birmingham recently rehabilitated 25 older homes for use as rentals for low- and moderate-income persons. The city was given credit for these units and told 50 more housing units for families would have to be provided.

Political observers in Birmingham did not foresee that the requirement necessarily would kill the senior housing project. Birmingham voters had in

1968 approved an open housing ordinance (the first city to do so in Michigan) and recently approved a half-mill levy for dial-a-ride for senior citizens. Plymouth was the third city in Michigan to adopt an open housing ordinance.

But as the campaign against the housing units escalated, rumors, innuendos and half-truths began to circulate around the city. Most of the rumors involved reports that large numbers of minorities and outsiders would be living in Birmingham. Attempts to dispel the rumors and emotions were unsuccessful.

What had happened is that most of the 50 family housing units were to have been placed in an existing lower-income area of Birmingham. Residents of these neighborhoods showed the greatest resistance. In Monday's election, for instance, 45 per cent of the residents of low-income precincts

voted against the senior housing proposal. In higher-income areas, the vote was much closer.

In Birmingham, as in Plymouth, the housing referendum was a confusing issue because of state and federal involvement. The government regulations were complicated and hard to understand. And there was a reaction against the regulations as representative of a type of federal intervention to achieve federal goals—goals which apparently weren't shared by most Birmingham voters.

PLYMOUTH RESIDENTS turned down the senior housing project for many of the same reasons that Birmingham residents voted no on Monday.

The major difference was the overriding concern in Plymouth on height. This wasn't a primary issue in Birmingham. (Forest-City Dillon had proposed an 11-13-story apartment building on the Wilcox property at Penniman Avenue and Union).

Much fear was expressed in the Plymouth housing referendum cam-

paign about minorities being forced in; that the project was being built for outsiders instead of Plymouth senior citizens. And objections were made about federal guidelines which didn't necessarily conform to local goals and priorities.

There was confusion here also about state and federal funding requirements and guidelines, and the technicalities of tax abatement never were fully understood.

Baptists raise funds for school

Nearly 200 people turned out Tuesday night to kick-off a fund raising drive that aims to collect \$400,000 to build a fundamentalist Christian school in Canton.

Sponsored by the Calvary Baptist Church of Plymouth, 43065 Joy, the school presently meets in Northville's Main Street School.

The church's plans call for a 14-room building located behind the existing church to be completed around the

fall of 1979. A major renovation of the church itself has already begun and should be completed by this fall.

The pastor of Calvary Baptist, the Rev. G. Douglas Routledge, is chairman of the fundraising effort. He spoke at Tuesday night's dinner along with Dr. Ronald Chadwick of the Grand Rapids Baptist Seminary.

Harry Guess, principal of the Christian academy, said the group expects to raise half of the cost of the school

through donations, the rest will be paid off by a mortgage. The school will serve nursery school students all the way through high school. Guess said. At present there are 16 faculty members.

"The school is not competing against the Plymouth-Canton schools," Guess said. "It will be offered as an alternative to people who want their children to have a Christian education with a strong biblical background."

How worry can ruin your day (week, month, year)

I re-learned a lesson a few weeks back on the futility of worry.

How many times have we been told that worry is a wasted activity, destructive, unnecessary and absolutely of no use to the worrier? It's useful to plan, but to fret over the future does no good.

I had learned that lesson a long time ago, and had been doing pretty good about avoiding worry. Worry is habit-forming and an easy trap to fall into. And, boy, did I ever fall into it easily last month.

A WOMAN LIVING in Dearborn Heights was selling her home and had a pool table in the basement to sell.

I wasn't really in the market for a pool table, or at least I didn't realize I was. But I heard about the table, and the price was good, and the next thing I knew I had made an offer.

It really was a good purchase, and I have no regrets today. But the purchase set off a series of needless worry.

The first series of things to worry about was how to move the table from

her house to mine—where to get a truck, whom to ask to help carry it, where to put it, etc.

After lining up a truck, and deciding where to locate the table, I then worried about whether I should first tile the basement and move the table in or move and then tile. (I ended up tiling half the floor, moving in the table, and then tiling the rest.)

The real worry, though, began when I began calling friends and neighbors to help me move. Every one agreed, on the first call, to help out. So it was no problem getting bodies.

But one of the volunteer movers gave me a lot to worry about. He warned that disassembling could be a major chore. He told of how some slate-top tables are assembled: holes are drilled through the slate, the screws are counter-sunk, and then a plaster-like material is placed over the fasteners. The plaster is sanded down and the felt top laid down. To disassemble, he suggested, we might have to rip off the felt top and chip out the plaster to get at the fasteners. He also advised the table might be too

heavy for four men to move, and might be too long to come down the basement stairs.

THAT BIT OF delightful advice really gave me a lot to worry about.

For five days I stewed over it, contemplating calling the manufacturer. I considered getting two more movers—even considered calling off the whole deal.

But moving day arrived, the table was easily disassembled, and four men were enough to get it up one set of stairs and down another.

BUT THE DAY didn't pass without a hitch.

I was so worried that morning about the disassembly, and getting the moving crew to the house at the same time as the truck was scheduled to arrive, that I completely overlooked an important part of the transaction—the purchase price.

I had left my house that morning without the checkbook. When I arrived and realized what had happened, I called home and my wife agreed to drive over with the checkbook.

The table was already disassembled, and the truck was backed up in the driveway waiting for its load. So we loaded the table onto the truck and it headed off for my house, while I waited (as a form of personal security) until the checkbook arrived.

Finally, my wife pulled up, handed me the checkbook through the window and waited to give me a ride home. When I went to write the check, I discovered there were no checks in the checkbook—the last one had been written the night before at the grocery store and I hadn't put new ones in.

The woman was gracious (easy to be when her table already was gone) and suggested the check could wait until the next day (which it did).

The day passed without incident; everything went smoothly, and I've since enjoyed many hours gaining back my pool-shooting skills from my college days.

I've re-learned the futility of worry. What happens will happen, and sometimes what won't happen will happen when we worry about things happening that are not likely to happen.

A tale of squiggles and seats

With only one column under my expanding belt, here I am reflecting on two of the most over-edited topics in existence.

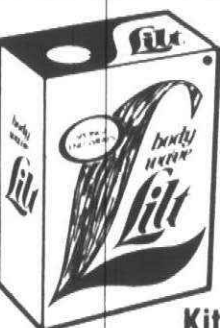

"all this time? I've been working with the people at Royal Holiday for months and all of a sudden he jumps in with a proposal that at first wasn't even presented in the proper form."

Stein said he has "stayed on top of things" regarding problems in Canton's mobile home parks and has been "wrestling" with Futernick since last July.

Referring to the defeat of Myers' proposal, Stein said, "The board did not feel this was an emergency situation. The attorney (Guth) knows what he's talking about—that's his job."

GUTH SAID the township could legally pass the mobile home legislation, but recommended the board "refrain from treating it as emergency legislation."

Myers said he "couldn't buy" Guth's opinion.

"It was just last week that he wrote a letter saying we need an emergency disorderly persons ordinance. You can pay an attorney \$30 to write anything on a piece of paper."

"I was stunned when the township board rejected it," Myers said. "What they're basically saying to the state is that 'we don't want to adopt your rules'. As it stands now, Canton officials have no power to stop landlords from setting minimum mobile home sale prices."

"If this ordinance is passed in Canton, local officials will be able to enforce the law in a couple of hours where it would take the state a week."

He will reintroduce the ordinance as emergency legislation at a future meeting, Myers said. He met with Guth recently to include parts of the MHC rules on mobile home sales in the ordinance.

ton Township stands a much better chance at getting Haggerty paved at a reasonable price than any private owner. Stein has been corresponding with U.S. Sen. Donald Riegle (D-Mich.) and U.S. Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor) attempting to secure federal money to help pay for Haggerty's paving.

The supervisor said he'll emphasize the point that Haggerty runs along I-275 in Canton and the expressway has no service drive. Finance Director Mike Gorman estimates that it would cost approximately \$1 million per mile to pave Haggerty.

TRUSTEE LYNNE GOLDSMITH wanted to know how soon the township can expect a return on its land investment.

Real estate broker Harold Fischer, a member of the commercial and industrial committee, said it would be at least 10 years before Canton completely recoups its "losses." Fischer saluted the board for its "foresight."

With this most recent land purchase Canton Township is currently in debt for \$2,183,053 plus interest on four land parcels.

That figure includes a \$800,000 spent earlier this year to purchase Fellows Creek Golf Course, although township officials expect green fees to pay off their yearly bond obligation.

It also includes \$203,066 plus interest needed to pay for 68 acres bought from Clarence Fischer on Sheldon, south of Michigan, to be used as a DPW site. The \$2,193,053 figure also takes in a \$126,000 bill owed to Detroit Edison for park land bought last year at Sheldon and Lilley.

The idea of rent subsidies provoked in some the fear that undesirables would be moving into the project—right next door to Kellogg Park, in the heart of the downtown area.

WHAT THESE FEARS express is a desire to keep things the way they are, to protect the status quo and avoid change which might disrupt comfortable residential patterns.

They are fears of the present generation of homeowners who purchased a home a decade ago for \$20,000 and which is now worth \$50,000. Homeowners become protective of any change which might threaten these high values.

This accounts for, in part, the reason why it is almost impossible to buy a used home in Plymouth or Canton and finance it with an FHA- or VA-backed mortgage. Not only must sellers pay points, but FHA and VA mortgages make it possible for low- and moderate-income persons to buy homes.

We've all communicated beyond the 5 senses

ESP means extra-sensory perception. One form of ESP is telepathy, a word coined in 1882 by a man named F.W.H. Myers.

Telepathy is communication between two minds without using any of the five known senses. It can be voluntary or involuntary.

For instance, when my oldest daughter became ill and was hospitalized here in Michigan, her friend, who was living in California, called to inquire about her well-being because he had dreamed she was ill.

ONCE, WHILE playing a pen and pencil game with my children, I suddenly realized that I had "doodled" the name of my cousin's husband all over my paper. I was not thinking of him at the time, and I could not imagine why I had written his name.

I went to the phone and called my cousin to tell her about it. However, she was not at home. Her son answered the phone and told me that a car on which his father had been working had fallen on him, and he had been taken to the hospital in an ambulance.

His mother had gone along and told her son to call and tell me to meet her at the hospital. The boy had been searching for my phone number when I called.

These are not unusual occurrences. I am certain such things happen to everyone several times a year.

How many times have you called someone just as they were getting ready to call you, or vice versa? Coincidence, you say? Maybe so, but I doubt it.

THE FRENCH WORD "clairvoyance" has become a common word in our own vocabularies. It means "perceiving beyond the limits of our known senses." Clairvoyance does not necessarily mean an awareness of the thoughts of another person. It simply applies to the extra-sensory knowledge of an objective event.

A clairvoyant may receive impressions about a third person through a subject who has close ties with that person.



A woman was told by a clairvoyant that someone close to her was in grave danger, and unless help was given, death would occur within the hour. Later that day, the woman received a telephone message that her sister, who lived in another state, had committed suicide at about the very time the prediction was being made.

Precognitive experiences occur in all our lives, but we often simply shrug them off, saying something like, "I had a hunch that was going to happen." But they are more than just hunches.

AROUND THE TURN of the century, a former seaman turned author wrote a book about a ship he called the "R.M.S. Titan," which weighed 45,000 tons and measured 880 feet in length.

His story told how, though she was believed to be unsinkable, she did sink on her maiden voyage, resulting in a terrible loss of lives.

It was the story, in accurate detail, of the building, specifications, and hideous fate of the R.M.S. Titanic, exactly as it took place. But the last three letters of the ship's name had been dropped in this fictional story.

The strange thing is that the story was written 10 years before the Titanic was built.

Just a few days before his death, Abraham Lincoln dreamed of wandering from room to room in the deserted White House. From these deserted rooms, he heard sobs. Upon entering the East Room, he saw a body lying in state and was told that it was the President, and that he had been assassinated.

Coincidence? Or ESP?

Retirement can be a lot of fun. Just take the word of Bill Hartman, well-known Plymouth resident, for that.

"Retirement can be what you make it," he said the other afternoon, "and there's no use of anyone being bored. If he is, he made it that way."

HARTMAN HAS BEEN retired since 1960 and has enjoyed every minute, even though he didn't like giving up his job with the Sinclair Oil Company where he had worked almost since childhood.

"I enjoy retirement. I read quite a lot, enjoy meeting friends at the Kiwanis Club every week, and I never miss my Masonic Lodge meetings. With these activities, there's little time to be bored."

Along with these activities, Hartman and his wife travel to Florida every winter and make their quarters at Smyrna, just outside of Daytona Beach.

In fact they had just returned to their home on Blunk Street from the annual trip when he smilingly explained that a person in retirement doesn't have to become bored—unless he wants to.

This year he took a trip to New Jersey enroute home from Florida, a stop they always enjoy with a daughter.

HARTMAN DOESN'T like to talk about it too much, but if you are lucky to find him in the right mood he'll tell you about his experiences in Plymouth politics, and that he is the only mayor ever recalled from office.

Years ago Bob Lidgard left the city commission, Hartman explains, and the late Charles Bennett and the late Paul Weidman called him down to the Mayflower Hotel. During the discussion they got him to agree to fill the vacancy. He filled out the term, ran again, and eventually became mayor.

It was in those years when Mrs. Ruth Whipple was in the center of a controversy with city hall which lead to the recall of several commission members—and Mayor Hartman.

That was enough for Hartman. He hasn't been involved in politics since, but he now looks back on that experience with a lot of laughs.

One of his pleasures these days is to walk downtown and have breakfast at the Mayflower Hotel with some of the people he worked with in the political arena, and discuss the path city government now is traveling.

In all his talk of retirement, Hartman goes back to the statement that he always liked his job. From the tone of his voice it is understandable that he favored raising the retirement age to 70 years.

When Hartman came to Plymouth in 1936, he had been transferred from Benton Harbor where he had been the sales representative of Sinclair Oil for a long time.

At the time he was sales manager and auditor of the company's activities in the state. He had started with the company as a distributor in Wayne when he was 31-years-old. And he advanced, step by step, until he became state sales manager and later had charge of the district which ran from Port Huron to Monroe.

ALL THE WHILE he tells you of his progress with the company, Hartman never fails to tell how much he liked his work that at one time had him stationed in Philadelphia.

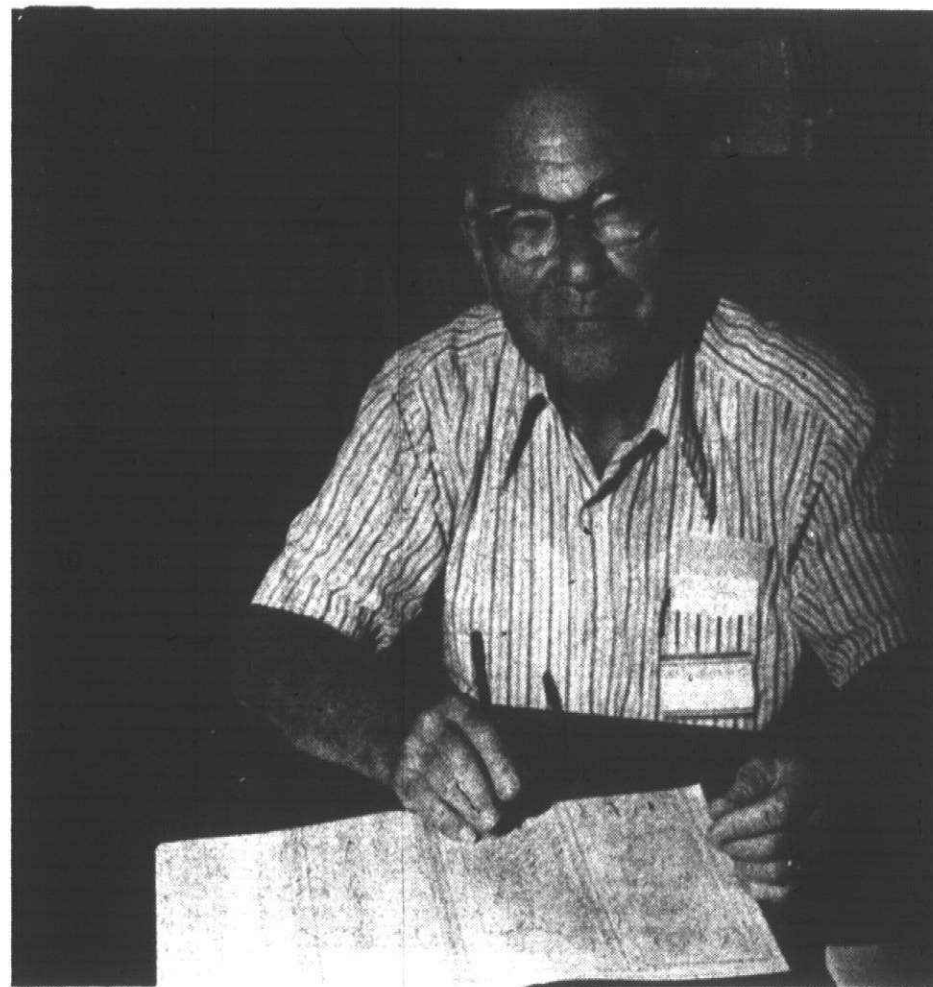
"It was down on Walnut Street, right near Bookbinders' famous seafood house. I sure enjoyed it. But then I liked every stage of my work."

But when it comes to retirement, Hartman is practicing what he preaches. He isn't allowing himself to become bored. He enjoys living too much. Instead he visits with his favorite authors, then strolls down to chat with his friends at breakfast at least

three mornings each week.

And, unlike many who would have scorned any mention of it, Hartman still can smile and enjoy a good laugh

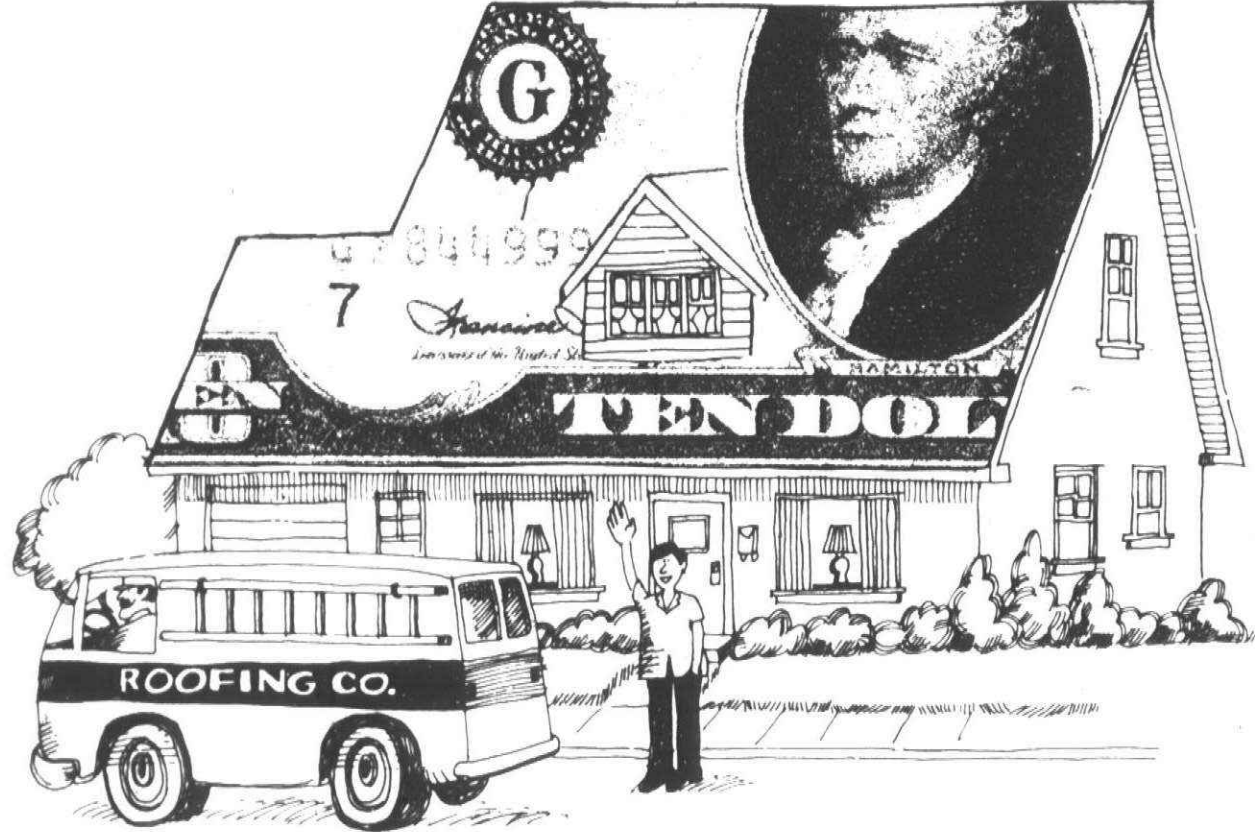

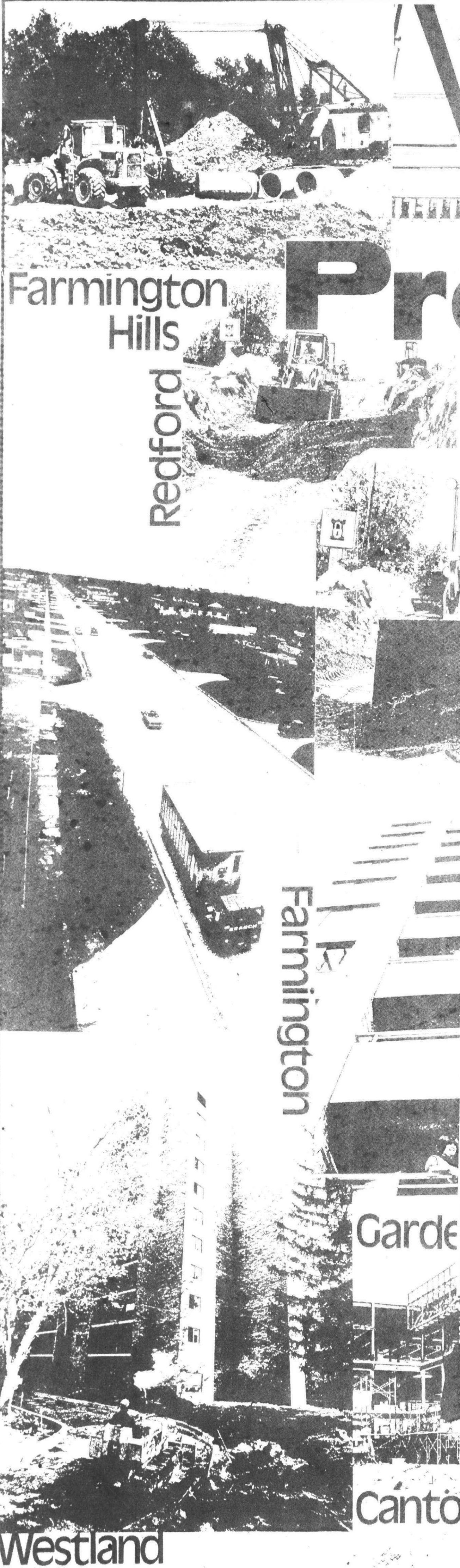

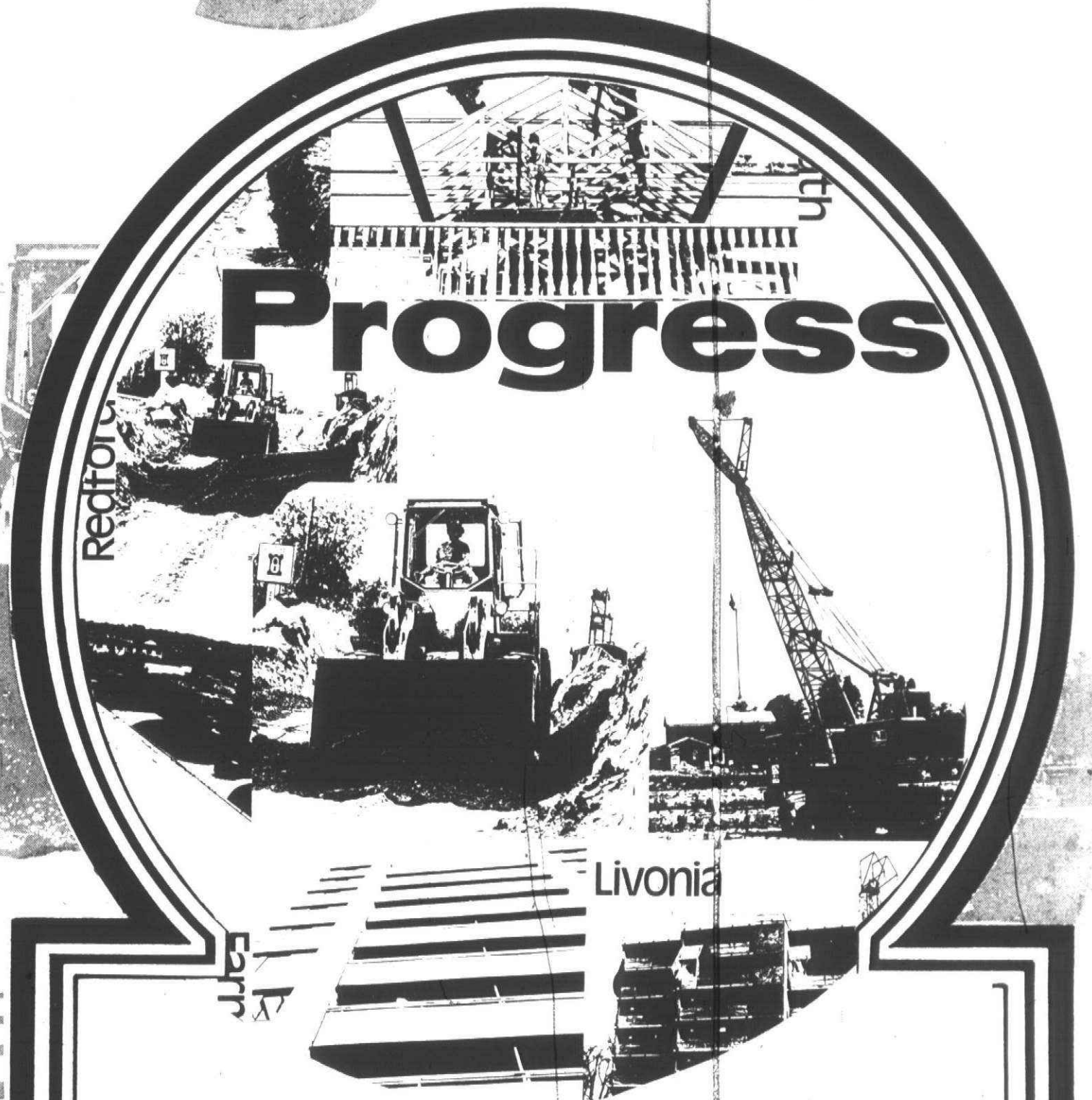

Computers seen as salvation for public transit

Computer-controlled public buses?

They are a reality in the Reading Road Corridor of Cincinnati, Ohio.

General Motors Corp. and the City of Cincinnati have teamed up to improve public transportation in the Queen City through a project called the Urban Transportation Lab.

The project's major goal is to improve scheduling and to use Cincinnati's fleet of buses more efficiently.

"In the 1940s, public transportation accounted for more than 20 per cent of all urban transportation. In the 1970s it has fallen to six per cent," said Harlan Neuville, manager of GM's transportation systems division. He spoke at a meeting of the Institute of Transportation Engineers at Southfield's Ramada Inn.

"If nothing is done to improve public transportation, it will fall to 2½ per cent by 1990," he said.

THE URBAN Transportation Lab is a product of the realities of modern-day mass transportation.

In an informal survey by the Detroit Department of Transportation, most bus passengers complained about long waits for buses which were never on time.

According to Neuville, the project has been so successful in the Reading Road Corridor that the transportation lab will recommend that four of the corridor's 60 buses be reassigned to other parts of the city.

The savings and efficiency were made possible by the minute-by-minute passenger and vehicle information relayed from each of the corridor's 60 buses to the transportation lab.

The Urban Transportation Lab is part computer center, part communications center and part data analysis center. Messages are relayed from mini-computers on board each bus to the lab headquarters.

The bus-bound computers relay information pinpointing the exact location of the bus en route and how many passengers are on board. It also passes along information which predicts when mechanical breakdowns are likely to occur, and analyzes what the problems are when breakdowns occur on the roads.

IN THE NEAR future, Neuville said, the transportation lab will begin installing computer-controlled message boards at Reading Road bus stops.

The boards will tell waiting bus passengers everything they always wanted to know. Passengers no longer will have to wait and wonder when the next bus will arrive or if seats will be available when it finally does. The

board will tell them that, too.

BUT WHY did GM decide to go to Cincinnati when the metropolitan Detroit area and SEMTA (South-eastern Michigan Transportation Authority) obviously need so much help in putting together an effective mass transit program?

"Cincinnati invited us," Neuville

said, matter-of-factly. With its relatively compact metropolitan area, the city was about the right size for these experiments, he continued.

THE READING ROAD corridor, a 16-mile-long band, stretches from downtown Cincinnati on the banks of the Ohio River, northeasterly to the suburbs.

Included in that corridor are: the 35,000-student University of Cincinnati, the U-C Medical Center, 11 major hospitals, and six major industrial firms—General Electric, Proctor & Gamble, and Ford Motor, for example—employing more than 50,000 persons.


Reading Road also is one of Cincinnati's major commercial strips.

"It had everything we were looking for," Neuville said.

TO EQUIP every bus of a metropolitan area's fleet would be an expensive proposition. Neuville estimated that it would cost between \$10,000 and \$15,000 to outfit each bus with the mini-computer and communications equipment.


"We're trying to make economic sense out of all of this. We're trying to figure out if it's cost effective," Neuville said.

He admitted that it would be impractical to equip every bus, but he maintained that system being tested by the Urban Transportation Lab can be "an invisible, silent partner to bus management."

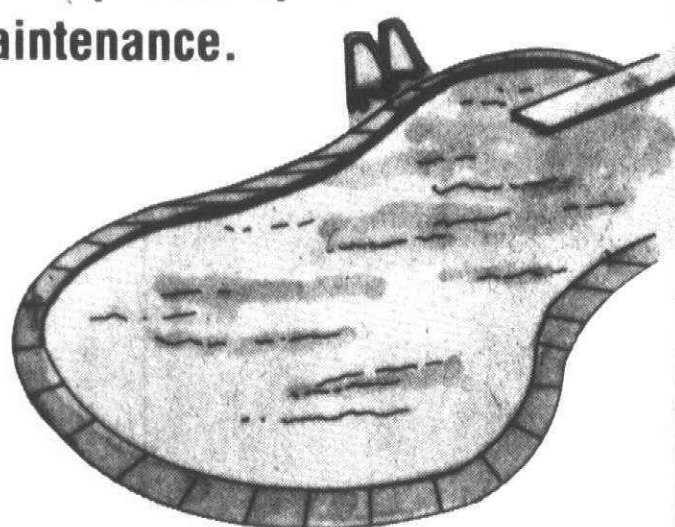

Waisting Aweigh

How to help an overweight child

Sometimes we adults become so concerned about our own overweight condition that we lose sight of the fact that our overweight children need help in taking off excess weight.

Statistics show that if a child has one parent overweight, chances are 40 per cent the child will be fat. If both parents have a weight problem, the odds double to 80 per cent,—overwhelmingly against the child. Fat parents will have fat children 80 per cent of the time.

THERE IS A DEEP concern among pediatricians and nutritionists that child obesity is a growing, national problem.

The reasons are multifaceted, with an increasing number of logical theories being espoused almost daily in an effort to understand why this is happening. But what is important, is to help the child now before he or she becomes an adult statistic in obesity research.

Helping a child overcome obesity—better yet, preventing it before it becomes a problem,—begins with his parents and his home environment. The responsibility rests squarely on

our shoulders. (This is to the exclusion of Prader-Willi Syndrome to be discussed in a future column.)

Leading pediatricians and nutritionists suggest that a person's dietary and eating patterns are established as early as his first six months of life,

with likes and dislikes established by ages six or seven years. Most parents are unaware of this. By the time their learn otherwise, (if ever) it is already too late to change the pattern. You must then deal with the problem by treating the symptoms.

IF THE RESPONSIBILITY begins with you, then, where do you begin?

With a good book on nutrition, and your grocery cart in the supermarket. Learn what is actually a well-balanced meal with all of the essential nutrients. You will quickly learn that to include all of the nutrients and calories the body requires daily there is no room left over for junk foods.

Examine your reward pattern for good behavior. Does your child's hurt feelings or cut finger warrant a lollipop or an extra piece of chocolate cake? Instead, reassure your child with affectionate hugs and kisses. Those will be close and tender moments, something a lollipop cannot provide.

Don't keep starchy and sweet snack foods around the house. While it is true that a child keeps his energy charged through a snack time, be sure the snack is nutritious, not empty calories.

When a child is successful in losing weight, don't reward him with his favorite candy bar. Instead, perhaps allow a special privilege or, if funds permit, a new personalized tee-shirt. The point is, use your imagination to find rewards other than food.

Children and adolescents respond well to peer encouragement and competition. Some diet organizations have membership plans and programs designed to inspire weight loss among that age group. You and your child may wish to consider this possibility together. But the final decision must be made by the child.

Enlist the aid of the other family members to help this child lose weight. Sometimes, family members subtly sabotage a child's efforts through teasing or deliberately tempting the child with goodies. If the whole family participates, lends encouragement and moral support, the family affair will become an enjoyable experience for everyone and not just the dieter.

One of the best books I have ever read on the subject of weight control for children is **Help Your Child Lose Weight and Keep It Off** by Gussie Mason (1.95 - Grosset and Dunlap).

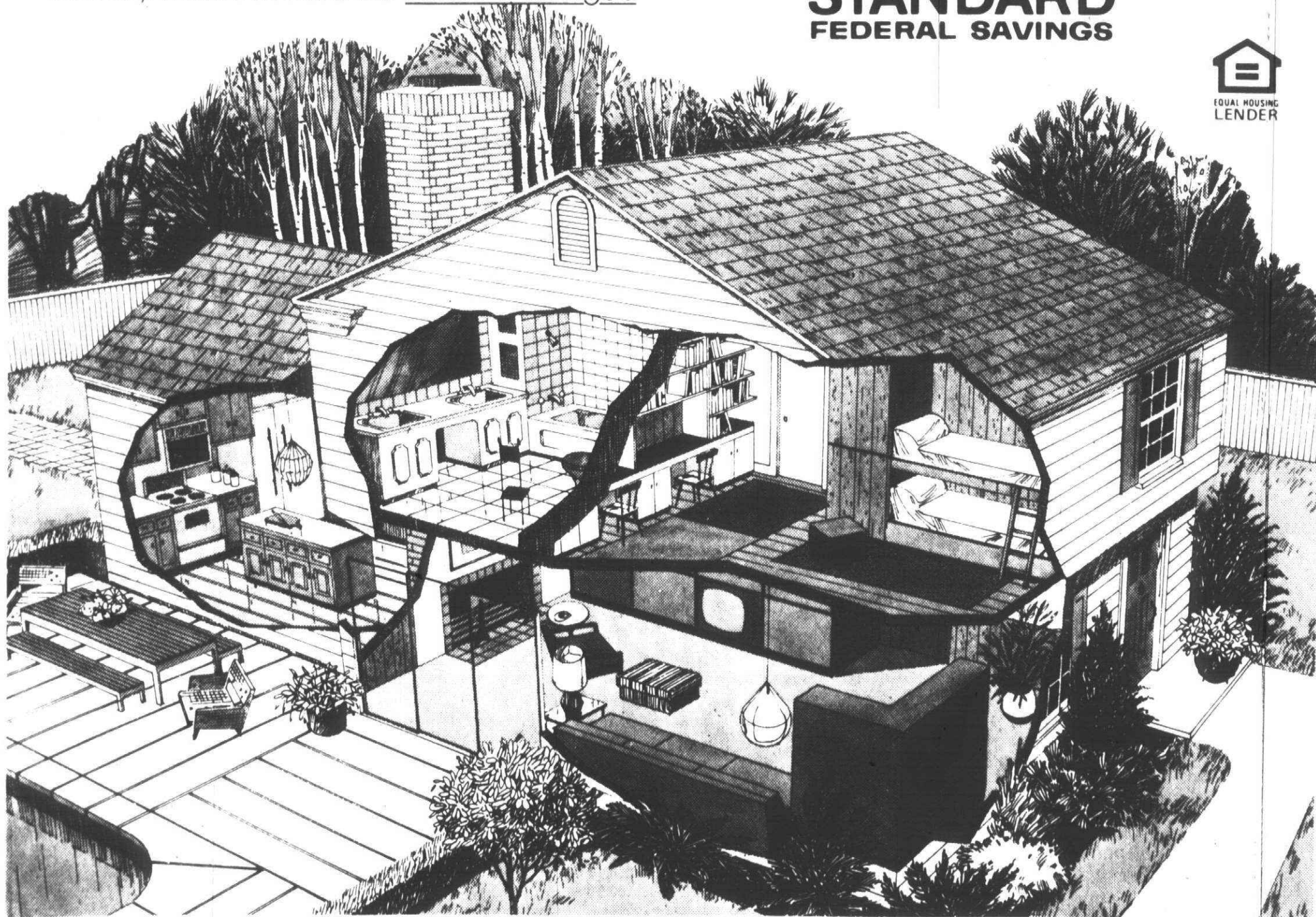

Satellite sites for airport parking asked

Jetting out may be a breeze, but parking isn't, says Wayne County Commissioner Thomas Presnell (D-Westland).

He called the situation at Detroit Metropolitan Airport "horrendous" and asked the board of commissioners to study the feasibility of setting up "satellite parking sites" around the county.

He said the additional parking space would be especially helpful during the "Christmas-Easter crunch."

Outlining his plan, Presnell said shuttle bus service could be arranged from parking sites at Wayne County General Hospital in Westland, the Child Development Center in Northville and the Warren Valley Golf Course in Dearborn Heights.

"I KNOW that the (Wayne County) Road Commission has plans to permanently increase the parking facilities at the airport. But I am not sure that the proposed parking will be ready in time or adequate to meet the growing number of people who are taking vacations during the Christmas-Easter holidays," he said.

"This Easter," Presnell said, "the airport and nearby lots were jammed, even though airport officials opened up an additional 1,000 spots."

He added that Detroit Race Course in Livonia and the Michigan State Fairgrounds located in Detroit could be part of the satellite parking system.

"Both have rented space to private companies for auto parking in the past," he said.

DETROIT RACE COURSE officials, however, said they were "aware" of Presnell's ideas, but had not been formally contacted.

Any plan to bring the Livonia race course into such a parking system would apparently require some zoning ordinance changes, though.

The race track recently received a notice of violating zoning ordinances for allowing 5,000 new Cadillac automobiles to be parked on its property.

"They were zoned to be a race track," said Chief Building Inspector Frank Kirby. "Apparently they were doing something other than that."

'Study' analyzed little about tax bills we pay

On April 27 Canton and Plymouth residents will go to the polls to vote on two school property tax proposals totalling five mills. Two of the mills would be additional.

The main reasons for the added millage are annual inflation ranging from five to 10 per cent and growing enrollment averaging 800 students per year.

The 900 additional students coming into Plymouth-Canton Community School District this fall will cost an additional \$1 million-plus.

That's why continued residential growth in Canton should be of interest to all residents because the cost of that growth is shared by us all.

AND SO WE SHARE the disappointment of some Canton Township trustees that the township's recent study on saving farmland did not take into consideration the impact on school taxes.

Canton Township spent almost \$25,000 on a study of the 30-year cost to taxpayers of buying \$15.2 million in development rights from farmers to the cost of providing municipal services if the land were fully developed.

The study analyzed some costs, but failed to consider the increased tax burden which would result if new schools had to be built to accommodate more school-age children moving into Canton if present farmlands became residential subdivisions.

That oversight "over looked" an added cost to taxpayers of more than \$1 million for this year

alone. You can imagine how high that cost will be over 30 years if farmland west of Canton Center Road should be developed into homes.

The relationship between residential growth and school cost is so direct that just last month Canton Supervisor Harold Stein appeared before the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education to report on the township's growth pattern.

Stein assured school trustees residential growth in Canton had reached its peak and likely will level off, providing farmland is preserved in the western half of the township. The supervisor correctly assumed that purchase of development rights from farmers by the township would be economically beneficial to the schools by putting the brakes on future residential growth.

BUT NOW THAT the long-awaited agricultural study has arrived, we are left with an analysis which overlooks 70 per cent—school taxes—of the real costs.

The study was myopic, analyzing cost-benefits for Canton Township government only. The researchers forgot that Canton residents are not served by township government alone, but receive major services and pay a lot of property taxes for other governments. The planners thought only in terms of their employer—township government. They failed to see the real world through the eyes of Canton residents, who pay school taxes and are concerned about school costs, county government, a community college and even metro parks.

Government studiously fuels inflation

The No. 1 concern on American minds, according to a Harris poll, is inflation, and it should be.

The cost of living has increased close to 75 per cent over the last 10 years, which means that if your income hasn't increased accordingly, you've lost ground in trying to maintain your standard of living.

If your income has kept pace, then you are in a higher tax bracket and may still have less buying power in your pocket.

THE MAJOR CAUSE of inflation in the United States is federal government deficit spending. When the government overspends, it borrows money, which allows the financial community to create money by loaning against governmental securities.

When there is more money produced, it becomes worth less.

Prices also go up if manufacturers are forced, because of governmental regulation, to add things to their products or factories that don't, in fact, increase productivity.

We have seen the prices of automobiles increase dramatically the last several years because of meeting safety and emissions standards and more recently fuel efficiency standards. Yet the users don't find the operating of these cars more productive or efficient because fuel costs have increased.

We have seen steel and paper prices go up because of pollution controls that are mandated for factories.

ECONOMISTS TELL us that the cost of living will continue to rise at a rapid rate this year because of the cost of food.

The price of food goes up and down according to supply and demand. The better the harvest, the lower the price.

Farmers claim they have been hurt the last couple of years because their prices per unit have decreased. They have had record-breaking harvests.

Because farmers are a strong voting bloc, President Carter has proposed that the government pay farmers for not growing crops. The proposal is a subsidy of so much per acre for not growing anything.

Not even considering the number of people starving around the world, the soil bank proposal—which isn't new—will reduce the amount of food available, increasing the price per unit the farmer receives.

WHAT DOES THAT mean to us? It means food prices will go up, and the cost of living will go up—artificially, by government action increasing inflation.

It will have a double-barrelled effect because the government payment will increase the federal deficit.

Of course, subsidies to farmers are nothing new. The federal government is paying more than \$80 million for price supports to tobacco farmers, while the Federal Communications Commission has banned cigarette advertising on radio and TV because smoking tobacco could be hazardous to your health.

It gets so frustrating that we are paying people in Washington to play games to appease special interests which just hurts the people paying the bills.

If inflation is the No. 1 concern to the people of this nation, why isn't it the No. 1 concern to our elected representatives?

Why one generation pays off another

Ask any 10 persons at or near Social Security age whether they really earned the benefits they are about to receive. Ten out of 10 will probably say "yes," emphatically.

That was the whole idea of Social Security back in the New Deal. Folks could retire in dignity. They wouldn't have to rely on welfare or charity.

A benevolent authority in Washington would extract a bit from the first \$3,000 of your wages and put it in a fund; the fund would be used to finance the federal debt; the interest earned on that fund plus new contributions would provide honest and deserving workingfolks a basic pension-type benefit to retire on.

It takes magnificent courage to tell those 10 persons they haven't really earned the benefits they're collecting. Nevertheless, a few magnificently courageous souls are beginning to say it.

DONALD S. MACNAUGHTON, president of Prudential Insurance Co. of America, recently gave the Detroit Economic Club some sharp-pencil calculations about earnings, taxes and benefits:

"Consider a man who first became covered under Social Security on Jan. 1, 1937, at age 26, who always earned the maximum wage covered by Social Security, who retired on Jan. 1, 1976, at age 65.

"He paid into OASDI taxes totaling \$6,217 over 39 years. His monthly benefit is \$364, so he gets his

total contribution back in 17 months. If he has a wife also eligible for benefits, their total Social Security income is \$546 a month, so they recover his taxes in 11 months," said MacNaughton.

Of course, that's oversimplifying because the employer was taxed, too, at least in legal fiction. (Actually, the employer figures the taxes and benefits he pays for as part of the cost of hiring the worker. Thus, the worker's productivity must be great enough to justify not only his wages but all the other costs the boss encounters in putting him on the payroll.)

Our man who retired at 65 in 1976 could expect to live another 14 years or so. Yet he would have been paid back all the taxes he paid in in only two or three years. The rest of the time, he and his devoted wife are collecting welfare disguised as Social Security.

TWO UNIVERSITY of Michigan accounting professors are saying much the same thing.

Donald R. Skadden and James E. Wheeler say "an element of welfare (has been) gradually incorporated into social security. . . . Presently

most retirees are getting more than their contributions would justify."

How, then, did we get into such an undignified mess?

One culprit is inflation — politicians who bought public office by raising benefits but not raising Social Security taxes sufficiently. Remember that fund that was supposed to earn interest and help pay benefits? It isn't there. It was never accumulated.

WHAT SOCIAL Security really is, according to MacNaughton, is neither welfare nor an insurance-type annuity.

"It is an inter-generational transfer program. Taxes levied on present employees and employers are used to provide benefits to a previous generation of workers," he says.

Not many persons would have the courage to say it out loud, but it's the truth.

What should be done about it? U.S. Rep. Bill Ford (D-Westland), from the 15th District, is co-sponsor of a bill to pay some benefits out of the general fund, which in effect means out of income taxes.

Others want to raise the tax on the employer, which is a joke on the worker because his labor still has to justify that cost.

Others say raise the wage base. . . . or don't pay benefits until folks are 68 or 70. . . . or don't tie benefits to inflation. . . .

The proposals are endless. I won't explore them here. The point is that it's time to recognize honestly that most retirees will get more benefits than they paid for.

Voice of spring

There are no leaves on the trees. Robins are few. Warm and balmy. The grass is brown. Trout season is a few weeks away.

What time is it? Baseball time, of course.

Or perhaps we should say Commercial Baseball. Even children, who are reputed to lack judgment and experience, aren't playing full-fledged games of baseball in the fields. Their activity so far is confined to games of catch on the sidewalks and streets. It's too cold and muddy for a baseball game.

Except in the Commercial Baseball industry, that is. The season that used to begin past mid-April has been pushed further and further forward on the calendar. How anything except an intrusion. The professional basketball playoffs are still forthcoming, and the Stanley Cup hockey playoffs are coming soon. Granted, the hockey season may be a little over-extended, but they have the excuse that they're indoors.

Sportswriters, an uncritical, believing crowd where commercial sports are concerned, dutifully record the goings-on of Commercial Baseball at this early date as if it were the most natural thing in the world. Well, speaking with the judgment and experience of kids in the streets, we say it's too cold for Commercial Baseball. Come back in a few weeks, gents.

Roll Call Report

Here's how area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes March 17 through 23.

HOUSE

CAMPAIGN FINANCING—Refused, 198 for and 209 against, to bring to the floor HR 11315, a bill making major changes in the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971. Most of the changes were aimed at reducing the money political parties and political action committees can contribute to House and Senate candidates, and at limiting the money spent by such candidates to gain election. Had the bill been brought to the floor for debate, an amendment to begin partial public financing of congressional campaigns would have been offered.

The bill was drafted by the Democratic-controlled administration committee. Much opposition centered on the fact that the Republican Party—which traditionally raises much more congressional campaign money than the Democratic Party—was widely seen as having been unfairly penalized by the proposed cut in campaign spending.

Rep. Frank Thompson (D-N.J.), a supporter, said: "To vote against this bill now would be to perpetuate the influence of special interest money at the expense of the individual citizen and, second, it would be to deny the House its right to debate the question of partial public financing."

Rep. James Quillen (R-Tenn.), an opponent, said: "What we have a case of here is an attempt on the part of some members of the majority to alter the political process in such a way as to deny the minority a fair chance of becoming the majority."

Members voting "yea" favored calling the bill up for debate.

Reps. David Bonior (D-Mount Clemens), William Ford (D-Taylor), William Brodhead (D-Detroit) and James Blanchard (D-Pleasant Ridge) voted "yea."

Reps. William Broomfield (R-Birmingham) and Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) voted "nay."

EDUCATION AID—Rejected, 156 for and 218 against, a bill providing the middle-class with more federal aid to defray tuition at colleges and other post secondary schools.

The main thrust of HR 11274 was to change the formula for awarding federal grants under the Basic Educational Opportunity Grant Program. Poverty students would continue to be major beneficiaries of the program, but under the bill a broader range of middle-income students would also become eligible for the federal grants.

During brief discussion on the floor, no supporters or opponents spoke on the merits of the bill.

The Democratic leadership, the administration and other supporters generally regarded direct grants to middle-income students as the best vehicle for easing the middle-class tuition crunch.

Opponents generally favored the Republican plan of providing tax credits rather than grants to offset tuition costs. Opponents also objected to the short-cut parliamentary procedure (no amendments allowed, two-thirds majority required for passage) under which the Democratic leadership had brought HR 11274 to the floor.

Members voting "yea" favored the bill.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted "yea."

Broomfield voted "nay."

Pursell did not vote.

FARM BILL—Voted, 224 for and 167 against, in opposition to the so-called "flexible parity" provision for farmers. This vote tabled an effort to have House conferees go along with Senate language implementing flexible parity. It came as the House considered an emergency relief bill aimed at easing the financial plight of farmers. The bill, now in House-Senate conference, would boost farm income by such measures as increased price supports. It is opposed by the administration as inflationary.

Flexible parity would enable a wheat, feedgrain or cotton farmer to set his own price support levels up to 100 per cent of parity, with the actual level dependent on how much land he agrees to take out of production. It would raise 1978 market prices of those crops.

No supporter of tabling spoke during debate. An opponent of tabling, Rep. Robert Bauman (R-Md.), said: "With all the many problems facing our farmers, the least we can do is to permit full debate on the parity issue. It is an insult to American farmers to treat this issue in such a cavalier manner."

Members voting "yea" were opposed to including the flexible parity provision in the emergency 1978 farm bill.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted "yea."

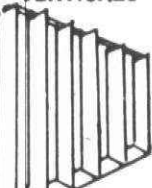
Broomfield and Pursell voted "nay."

SENATE

FARM BILL—Passed, 67 for and 26 against, the Emergency Agricultural Act of 1978, a measure aimed at improving the 1978 income of farmers. Among many provisions, it raised price support and subsidy levels on grains and cotton, enabled farmers to gain immediate cash by setting aside more acreage, and provided for "flexible parity" linking price support levels to the amount of acreage set aside.

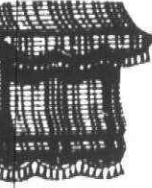

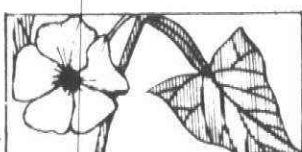

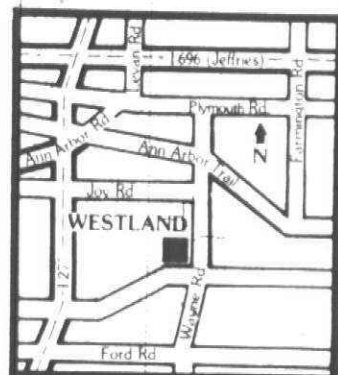

She hopes for results from Urban Causeway

"It's not a club," said Muriel Heidt, president of Metro Detroit Church Women United (CWU). "It encompasses women from 21 denominations and is interracial."

As she nears the end of her first year as president, Mrs. Heidt has been making more trips than usual from her Plymouth home to the CWU headquarters in Detroit. As well as her regular duties, she is involved in plans for "Urban Causeway," a national project.

"It is an exciting plan. This may be one of the most important things church women can be doing. What an original way to approach the problems of our cities."

For three weeks, from April 15 through May 5, Church Women United will undertake an Urban Causeway. Three teams of approximately 25 women each will travel through the south, east and west converging in Chicago for the celebration of May Festival Day.

Each of the three groups will focus on six issues chosen by CWU during the Bicentennial year as the most pressing needs.

"WE TOOK A poll to establish need," said Mrs. Heidt. "The six most predominant issues were housing, welfare, transportation, education, medical and health care, and employment. These became the people's platform which was presented to President Carter."

Citing statistics that 75 per cent of the population lives on two per cent of the land, CWU members believe that the future of all Americans is tied to urban decisions and activities.

As the teams visit the large cities, they will be met by a receiving team which will provide not only hospitality, but in-depth insights into the area.

The Eastern Traveling Team, originating in New York City, will arrive in Detroit at the end of April. Their tour is aimed at reflecting experiences in New York, Newark, Washington, D.C., Pittsburgh and Cleveland as well as Detroit. Mrs. Heidt and her group will be responsible for what they see in Detroit.

"WE HAVE PLANNED three presentations. We will tour the Cass Corridor, visit and talk with the people at

Focus Hope, the Detroit Job Corps Center, an automobile plant, the Butzel Family Center on Kercheval, Nicholas Hood's church, and the Evangelical Home for retarded children and senior citizens.

"We hope to to arrange a dinner with Mayor (Coleman) Young in the Manoogian Mansion."

Mrs. Heidt discussed the regular, everyday, involvement of Church Women United. "Our Outreach program works with Meals for Shut-ins, Focus Hope, a haven for battered women, and 'Believe in Detroit' (a group promoting the city)."

She added, "And I do believe in Detroit. My family had been urging me to move to Plymouth for years. Finally, I got mugged and I moved."

Church Women United has sponsored several overseas causeways but this is the first domestic one. They hope to widen their experience of community and to deepen sensitivity to the aspirations of others.

The purpose of Urban Causeway is to recognize alternative solutions to urban problems and pinpoint resources available to aid in the solutions.

Career choice may need updating

A dress bought 10 years ago probably isn't wearable today.

And the same may be true of a career choice made 10 years ago. To get any use from either, both may need to be updated.

If you are a woman who put aside her career to rear a family, Betty Wagner, an instructor at Schoolcraft College's Women's Resource Center, thinks now may be the time to "try on" a different career.

She said the first ingredient for selecting a new career is "to know yourself—your interests, your skills

and your personal strengths."

One way to accomplish this, she suggested, is to write an autobiography identifying highlights in one's life, trends of interests, skills and values.

BUT WHILE being autobiographical, Ms. Wagner said it's important to beware of limiting stereotypes.

"Studies have shown that women tend to limit themselves by avoiding occupations which require mathematics," she said.

In a study of women students at Berkeley, Calif., she said, it was noted that 92 per cent were in traditional woman-type career choices, partly

because they wanted to avoid math.

"But a woman who wishes to advance is going to need math if for no other reason than to understand budgets, graphs and statistics," Ms. Wagner said.

Schoolcraft College, she told the women, is trying to do something about this particular career hangup for women with its course, "Eliminating Math Anxiety," created by the resource center and offered through the college.

In a lifetime, said Ms. Wagner, most people go through a process of career development with stages from thinking about abilities, exploration, trial

jobs and finally stable work and work maintenance.

But a woman who interrupts her career usually finds herself back at the exploration stage in mid-life, she pointed out.

SHE SUGGESTED several concrete steps to take when thinking about a career change.

- Visit your library and make up a bibliography on job applications and career planning. Look through the Dictionary of Occupational Titles and the "Occupation Outlook Handbook."

- Go to your nearby community college women's resource center to talk to a counselor and check on literature that may be available there.

- Take a career counseling course at the community college.

- Go back to the library and check out the book titled "What Color Is Your Parachute?" by Richard Nelson Bolles. It's a practical manual for job hunters and volunteer workers.

"And don't under-estimate volunteer work as a chance for self-development," Ms. Wagner said. "There

has been an upgrading of the volunteer status recently, and volunteer agencies can offer opportunities for career development and testing of career choices."

BETTY YOUNG, founder and past president of Home Economists in Action, also had some advice.

"Don't rule out creating your own career," she said, adding that in this case the key is finding a need and filling it.

"Pick your skills, talents and interests and plug them into a need," she suggested. "Create your own job."

She added that an applicant going to an established company has a better chance to land the job if she goes into her interview with the idea that "I think I have the skills to add to your company."

Both women emphasized it takes action to start a new career or land a job at mid-life.

"If you sit back and wait for it to happen, it never will," said Ms. Young. "Nobody will find a job for you."

Red Cross warns of poison dangers

Your house contains many poisons that could cause the death of or injury of a child, emphasized the Red Cross at the beginning of Poison Prevention Week, which starts Sunday, March 19.

At the same time, the American Animal Hospital Association added that pets can also be poisoned in the home.

The Southeastern Michigan chapter of the American National Red Cross has two sets of measures to follow to keep your home safe. One set applies to children, the other to persons of all ages.

To keep children safe, here are five suggestions:

- Keep household products out of sight and out of reach of children, preferably in a locked closet or cabinet. When using one of these products, remove the container to a safe area if you must leave the room even for an instant.

- Store medicines separately from household cleaners. Always keep these items in their original containers. Never place them in cups, soft drink bottles or bottles bearing other prescription labels.

- Since children tend to imitate adults, avoid taking medication in their presence.

- Forbid small children to eat or drink medicines, chemicals, plants or berries they come across. Insist on this continually.

- Always refer to medicines by their proper names when discussing them with children. Do not refer to them as candy. Exercise particular caution when storing pills which resemble candy in shape, color or taste.

- For people of all ages, the Red Cross has five other recommendations to avoid poison danger:

- Never take medicine from an unmarked bottle. Be sure all products are correctly labeled before using the medication.

- Always turn on a light when taking or dispensing medicine at night.

- Weed out old or unused medications from your medicine cabinet regularly. Dispose of them by flushing them down the drain, rinsing the container in water and discarding it. Date all drugs when you purchase them.

- Do not eat or serve foods which appear abnormal.

- Protect eyes and skin when using insecticides, weed killers, solvents and

cleaning agents. Read and follow directions carefully. Be sure to wash thoroughly after each use of these products and promptly remove contaminated clothing. If spillage occurs, clean up thoroughly.

The Red Cross urges that parents, especially of small children, enroll in a first aid course in which poison prevention and emergency care are covered in detail. For information, call the organization at 833-4440.

While worrying about children and poisons, the American Animal Hospital Association suggests thinking about pets and poisons. The organization points out that people are usually careful when using known poisons about the home, but are careless with unrecognized poisons.

"For example," says the association, "an overdose of flavored children's aspirin can be as toxic to pets as to children."

Another toxic substance not often recognized as dangerous is furniture polish. It has an attractive scent, color and possibly a pleasant taste. However, most furniture polishes contain petroleum distillates which are toxic.

"Many products used in the family are highly toxic," said Dr. William J. Westcott of Westcott Hospital for Animals, 24429 Grand River, Detroit, a former president of the animal hospital association.

"Particularly hazardous are car coolants or antifreeze and windshield washing solutions."

Some common plants can also cause illness in both children and pets if chewed or swallowed, the association warned. Be careful of philodendron, azalea, poinsettia, rhubarb plant leaves and a wide variety of others.

Examination of plants will help determine if a child or pet has chewed on a leaf or stem.

Give a thought to taking leaf samples to a florist, garden center, museum or county agent to determine the toxic varieties. Keep a toxic scrapbook. It might prevent an emergency.

Children can tell when something is wrong with them, but pets do not have this advantage. "Learn the symptoms of poison-induced illness such as vomiting, drooling, shallow breathing, convulsions, abdominal pain and weakness," Westcott advised.

Horowitz leads list for U-M May festival

Vladimir Horowitz heads the list of guest artists for The University of Michigan's 85th annual May festival, April 27-30, in Hill Auditorium.

Presented by the University Musical Society, this season's festival concerts will also feature Eugene Ormandy and the Philadelphia Orchestra, conductor Robert Shaw, tenor John McCollum, clarinetist Anthony Gligliotti, cellist William Stokking, and the 275-voice University Choral Union, Donald Bryant, director.

Ormandy and the Philadelphians are now in their fourth decade of continuous participation in the festival.

On April 30, Horowitz and Ormandy will repeat the "Golden Jubilee Concert" program they performed in New York City's Carnegie Hall on

Jan. 8 with the New York Philharmonic: Beethoven's "Egmont" Overture and Seventh Symphony, and Rachmaninoff's Third Piano Concerto. That occasion marked not only the 50th anniversary of Horowitz' American debut, but also his first appearance with orchestra in 25 years.

The April 30 concert here will represent Horowitz' first May festival appearance as well as his first concerto performance in Ann Arbor since his debut here at age 24 in 1928, when he played the Rachmaninoff Third Concerto with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Victor Kolar conducting.

Horowitz launched his golden anniversary season with an Oct. 9 recital here at Hill Auditorium. "What a wonderful city is Ann Arbor," Horowitz stated while discussing concert audiences in a

Jan. 8 New York Times interview, "the colleges are the aristocracy of the public."

On April 29, conductor the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and Chorus since 1967. He is the recipient of the Governor's Award for Distinguished Service and Governor's Award in the Arts for the state of Georgia, and, together with his orchestra, won ASCAP's first prize for "Service to Contemporary Music" in 1976.

Professor of voice at U-M's School of Music, McCollum has sung as a leading tenor of the New York City Opera, the Santa Fe Opera Company, the Washington Opera Society, and the NBC Opera Company. He has sung here as soloist with orchestra on numerous occasions since his Ann Arbor debut in 1954, and has served

as chairman of U-M's Robert Shaw will lead the Philadelphia Orchestra, tenor John McCollum, and the University Choral Union in the Ann Arbor premiere of Berlioz' "Requiem Mass, Op. 5."

Founder of the Robert Shaw Choral, Shaw has been music director of voice department and director of the University Division of the National Music Camp.

Now in its 99th year, the University Choral Union has performed at

May festivals since 1894, offering a wide range of literature, including several world premieres. A conductor, pianist, and composer, Donald Bryant achieved renown as director of the Columbus Boychoir School before assuming direction of the Choral Union in 1969.

Solo clarinetist of the Philadelphia Orchestra since 1949, Gligliotti is a member of the Philadelphia Woodwind Quintet, and a professor at the Curtis Institute of

Music and at Temple University. Stokking, formerly principal cellist of the Chamber Symphony of Philadelphia and the Cleveland Orchestra, succeeded Samuel Mayes as principal cellist of the Philadelphia Orchestra.

On the festival's opening night, April 27, Ormandy will lead his orchestra in Strauss' "Don Juan," Debussy's "La Mer," and Sibelius' First Symphony.

Art work of contemporary black South Africans shown

The only body of art work by contemporary black South Africans to be shown in America will be presented at the Detroit Institute of Arts from April 4 through May 14.

Nine young African artists who studied at the Rorke's Drift School in Natal on the border of Zululand are represented by 58 etchings and linocuts.

"Black South Africa: Contemporary Graphics" was assembled for Detroit exhibition at the request of Michael Kan, deputy director of the art institute and curator of African, Oceanic and New World cultures at the Brooklyn Museum. The works concentrate on three themes—village life, contemporary urban life and Bible stories.

"They have such an immediate appeal and represent so well the culture, lore, aspirations and problems of South African blacks that they almost interpret themselves," Duchac said. "Many of the graphics present strong

statements on the status of blacks, collectively and as individuals, in South Africa today."

THE ART AND CRAFT Centre at Rorke's Drift was started in the early 1960s to offer fine arts education to blacks under the aegis of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Courses included textile weaving, graphics, sculpture, pottery and silk-screen printing. Since the late '60s, students and graduates have produced a number of impressive linocuts and etchings.

"Black South Africa: Contemporary Graphics," installed by curatorial assistant Nadean Murchison in Gallery 150 of the museum's Ford Wing, will be open to the public during regular hours, 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Tuesday-Saturday. Admission is free.

A 64-page exhibition catalogue with 58 black and white illustrations is \$4.95 at museum shops.

Detroit symphony hosts violinist...

Music Director Antal Dorati will be joined by violinist Henry Szeryng in three performances this week at Ford Auditorium with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.

The Thursday and Saturday performances are at 8:30 p.m. and the Friday morning NBD coffee concert is at 10:45 a.m. preceded by a complimentary coffee hour at 9:30. John Guinn, MusicCritic, for the Detroit Free Press will conduct an on-stage pre-concert interview with Maestro Dorati at 10:15 a.m.

The program will include the symphony's premiere performance of Bartok's Suite No. 1, Op.3. In addition, Jeremiah Clarke's "Prince of Denmark's March" (formerly attributed to Henry Purcell) and Beethoven's Violin Concerto will be performed.

Violinist Henry Szeryng was born in Poland and became a Mexican citizen in 1946. He has won the "Grand Prix du Disque" for recording six times and is now acknowledged as one of the great violinists of our time. This is his fifth appearance with the symphony—the last in December of 1972.

A limited number of tickets for students and senior citizens are available at the box office from 7:30 p.m. on concert nights. Tickets are available at the Ford Auditorium box office, all Hudson's and Ward's ticket outlets, and the "Detroit Tonight" desk at the Plaza Hotel in the Renaissance Center. Master Charge and VISA charge card customers may order tickets by phone at 962-5524.

...plans recordings and festivals...

At least four major announcements concerning the Detroit Symphony made last week have changed the growth tempo of the orchestra from moderate to fast.

Antal Dorati, music director, while emphasizing dramatic improvement of the symphony, revealed the orchestra has signed a recording contract with London Records. The orchestra will make at least three LPs a year under his leadership. There is a three-year option clause in the one-year contract.

Dorati told a conference last Friday that the selections he has chosen to record were to achieve both a commercial and an artistic success.

They include a Bartok album featuring "Deux Images and Suite No. 1, Opus 3; An all-Tchaikovsky album comprised of the "1812 Overture," "Marche Slave" and "Capriccio Italien;" and an album of rhapsodies, Dvorak's Rhapsody No. 3 in A-flat, Enesco's Rhapsody No. 1, Ravel's Rhapsody Espagnole and Liszt's Hungarian Rhapsody No. 2.

WHEN SOUND engineers from London-Decca came to Detroit to test locations for recording, they chose the United Artists theater as the best, although it has been vacant since 1970.

The recording sessions will be April 7-10.

When asked if there would be an audience at the recording sessions, Dorati looked incredulously at the questioner and said, "Definitely not; if you sneeze, it costs \$1,500."

The first album will be released during the 1978-79 concert season.

Along with the recording contract, Dorati confirmed a rumor that the symphony will tour Europe in 1979. Although he didn't reveal the locations for the concerts, he said all those on the continent would be in Western European countries.

Plans for a second major mid-season festival in Detroit also were outlined by the mmestro, who pronounced the first, the Beethoven one of last fall, a tremendous success.

With a smile, Dorati said there is often a "sameness" to the symphony's

season and the festivals provide excitement.

The festival, Nov. 2-15, will be devoted to Schubert and the Viennese school of music. This year marks the 150th anniversary of Franz Schubert's death.

The festival will include four orchestral performances and the American premiere of Schubert's opera "Alfonso und Estrella" along with chamber music by the Bern Quartet from Switzerland.

SOLOISTS SCHEDULED for the festival include Ilse Von Alpenheim, Redd Joselson and Murry Perahia, pianists; Itzhak Perlman, violinist; Elizabeth Soderstrom, Maureen Forrester and Peter Lager, vocalists.

A Schubert Mass is also scheduled to be performed by the University of Michigan orchestra and chorus.

There will be a Christmas festival this year and an opera/ballet festival with the Joffrey ballet next February and March. The opera, the first ever to be staged at Ford Auditorium, will be "Elektra" by Richard Strauss. This

will be the first in a number of Strauss programs which will include his tone poems and culminate with a concert version of his opera, "The Egyptian Helen," on April 24.

This opera will also be performed at Carnegie Hall in New York City on April 27 and in Kennedy Center, Washington D.C. on April 29. Dorati will direct both Detroit Symphony performances in the two cities.

RICHARD L. Terrell of Bloomfield Hills, chairman of the symphony's 1978-79 fund drive, and Robert B. Semple, symphony board president, both added as they announced the opening of the new fund drive, that all of these plans call for additional funds.

This year's fund drive goal is \$1.55 million. Terrell, vice-chairman of General Motors, spoke of the need to broaden the base and attract more small, individual contributors as well as larger corporate gifts.

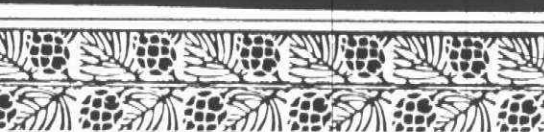

Reptiles make hit at schools

What elementary school-aged youngster would pass up the opportunity to actually touch a real live Burmese python?

Very few did this week when Gordon Carey brought his lecture-demonstration on reptiles to Smith, Field, Gallimore and Fiegel elementary schools.

"We've got to wash our hands lots of times now because we touched that snake," said a small girl at Gallimore. The lecture ended just before their lunch break.

The reptile program was listed by the Plymouth Community Arts Council as one available to schools from the School Assembly Bureau in Pennsylvania. It was a big hit in the four schools that took advantage of the lecture.

The purpose of the program was to acquaint students with the four families of reptiles—turtles, crocodilians, lizards and snakes.

"Most people have a little fear of reptiles," said Carey. "This comes from a lack of knowledge. What I want to do is give you an understanding of reptiles."

HE SHOWED live specimens from each group.

He explained the difference between a tortoise and a turtle. The tortoise lives on land and the turtle lives in the sea.

He said the crocodile, with its pointed snout and teeth, was more dangerous than the snub-nosed alligator.

He showed them a small and then a larger American alligator.

Carey also had two lizards—large and small. But the snakes were the unqualified stars of the show.

He started with three little rat snakes, then a small boa constrictor. There were squeals from his audience as he produced a larger boa and finally the eight-foot Burmese python.

He told them the python could reach a length of 20 feet. Carey said the boa constrictor is a "pet shop" snake and told them how to care for them.

"THEY'RE NOT slimy and are dangerous only if you try to hurt them. They bite only if they can't get away." Throughout the program, he talked

about the animals being specialized. The shapes of their bodies gave them protection and enabled them to live in their natural habitat—land, water, burrows, etc.

Most of the questions were about snakes.

"How come he doesn't squeeze you?"

"He has no reason to."

"Why do they look shiny?"

"Their scales are very smooth."

"Are there any poisonous snakes in Michigan?"

"Yes."

It was time for lunch at Gallimore, so many questions had to go unanswered.

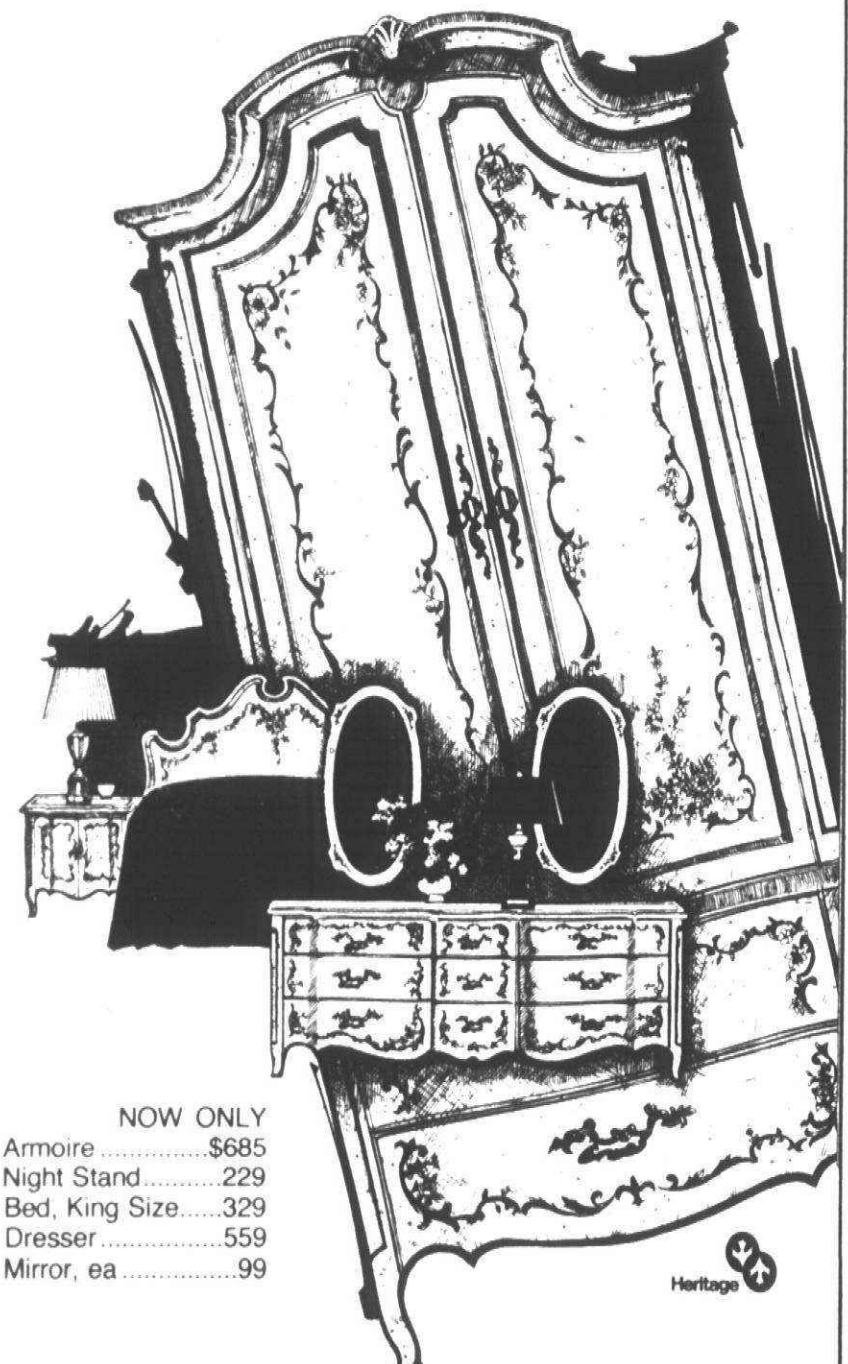



Observer honors gal spikers

What excellent seasons area volleyball teams recorded this past winter!

Clarenceville, undefeated in 18 dual matches, won the Class B state championship and claimed, for the third year in a row, the Metro West Conference title.

Westland John Glenn advanced to the semifinals in the Class A portion of the state tournament after winning the Northwest Suburban League championship.

Livonia Churchill, Western Six League pace-setter, rolled as far as the quarterfinals in the Class A tourney.

Livonia Bentley sat atop the Suburban Eight League standings and Livonia Stevenson won the Inter-Lakes League race.

With so much apparent talent to choose from, area coaches faced a difficult task determining the all-Observer volleyball teams at a recent gathering.

Following are the results of that meeting:

FIRST TEAM

Lisa Redford, junior, Clarenceville. An all-state selection this season, Redford, a spiker and blocker, also was named to the all-tournament teams at the Plymouth and Clarkston Invitionals.

The junior hitter is one of the few players in the state who can spike the ball for a kill from the back row. She was selected the Trojans' Most Valuable Players both this season and last.

A natural athlete, Redford is also an accomplished swimmer, track performer and softball player. She carries a grade point average of 3.6.

"Lisa is probably the finest all-around athlete to represent Clarenceville in its 40-year history. That includes both men and women," said coach Tom Teeters.

Debbie Dernay, senior, Livonia Stevenson. Also an excellent all-around athlete, Dernay was the premier player on the Stevenson squad which

won its first 12 matches of the season before experiencing defeat.

A spiker, Dernay had a kill percentage (unreturnable) of 82 this season. She also excelled in the other phases of the sport.

"Debbie is a very strong blocker and server," said Stevenson coach Joe Jandasek. "She would really hustle and make some very good saves. She was a very fine all-around player."

Debbie Mays, senior, Livonia Bentley. Mays, co-captain of the Bulldogs, was named to the all-state team, the all-Suburban Eight squad and was selected Bentley's Most Valuable Player.

She has earned three letters for volleyball and is expected to have won nine in all sports combined by the time she graduates this spring.

The tall, six-foot hitter aces 51 per cent of her spikes and served as an effective center-blocker throughout the season.

"Debbie is one of the more talented net players in the area," said Bentley coach Dana Hardwick. "She had the ability to read a team's defense and to hit accordingly."

Kelly Heaton, junior, Plymouth Canton. Also, an all-state honoree, Heaton this season was named the Most Valuable Player at the Plymouth Invitational.

She was selected for the all-Western Six League team this winter and won her third varsity letter for volleyball participation.

The 5-11 spiker was deadly at the net.

"Kelly was a team leader, the most powerful and consistent spiker on the varsity this season," said Canton coach Cyndi Burnstein.

Year-round programs hurt prep athletics

Is there any fun left in high school sports for the athletes or the coaches?

Recently, I talked with many coaches who have complained or resigned because of the constant strain of interscholastic competition.

I've also talked with many players who once were active in three sports at the middle school and freshmen level but have quit many of these activities because of the time it takes to dedicate themselves to each sport.

With college athletics becoming "big time" money operations for the universities over the past 20 years, we have seen quite a push for year-round athletic programs to help stay competitive with other colleges.

The constant pressures and battles with the recruiting of high school athletes has turned many of these college programs into businesses rather than sports and recreation. The loyal alumni have a lot to do with this also and their pressures to win have caused many coaches to be fired or to resign.

WHILE I can accept the "big business" attitude of universities because of financial reasons, it's very hard for me to accept this same philosophy with 15, 16 and 17-year old high school students.

Yet, we constantly find coaches and athletic programs at the prep level trying to imitate the colleges. And because of this, many coaches and athletes in this area find themselves in a vicious circle they can't escape.

I'm speaking about the recent trend of building prep programs on a year-round basis. We see this constantly at the football level, not just with off-season weight training, but continuous conditioning and drills.

Basketball, baseball, swimming and wrestling are all the same way. It just seems it isn't enough for athletes to play one of these sports during the fall, winter, or spring months.

There also has to be some kind of clinic or summer program which puts greater demands on a coach and player to succeed in the sport.

The same holds true with girls sports as well. And it's a shame, because the same girls teams which win year-after-year have some kind of off-season program.

I'M NOT blaming these coaches or programs for putting extra time, effort, and demand on high school athletes.

Because, unfortunately, these programs have no choice. The coaches must run these year-around programs and athletes must continue to work hard to remain competitive with all the other teams in the area.

This is where we experience our vicious circle.

Once a few coaches stress a year-around program for preps, then the other coaches must follow suit or they can't stay competitive.

But it has got to end somewhere because many coaches and athletes are getting tired of it—because only the specialized athlete in one sport can gain anything from such a system.

The all-around athletes, who wish to play three sports, have trouble enjoying their personal lives because they are stuck in a gym or on a field for 12 months a year.

And I know many coaches who are very tired of dedicating so much time and effort to their programs because they also have family lives and responsibilities to meet.

This is one of the many reasons why we find so many coaches quitting because of "personal reasons."

But for those who won't quit, they continue to run year-round programs no matter how tired they are—simply because they feel they have an obligation to the sport, the school, and most of all the athletes.

IT'S A VICIOUS circle which I hope someday will break. For this is just not the way high school athletics should be run.

When I go to a game, I like to see family, friends, coaches and athletes come together for good, clean competition.

But the way things are now-a-days, there is so much stress and strain with each contest that I really wonder if it's enjoyable for the people involved.

When I think of high school athletics, I wish I could think about having fun.

But it's just not that way anymore.

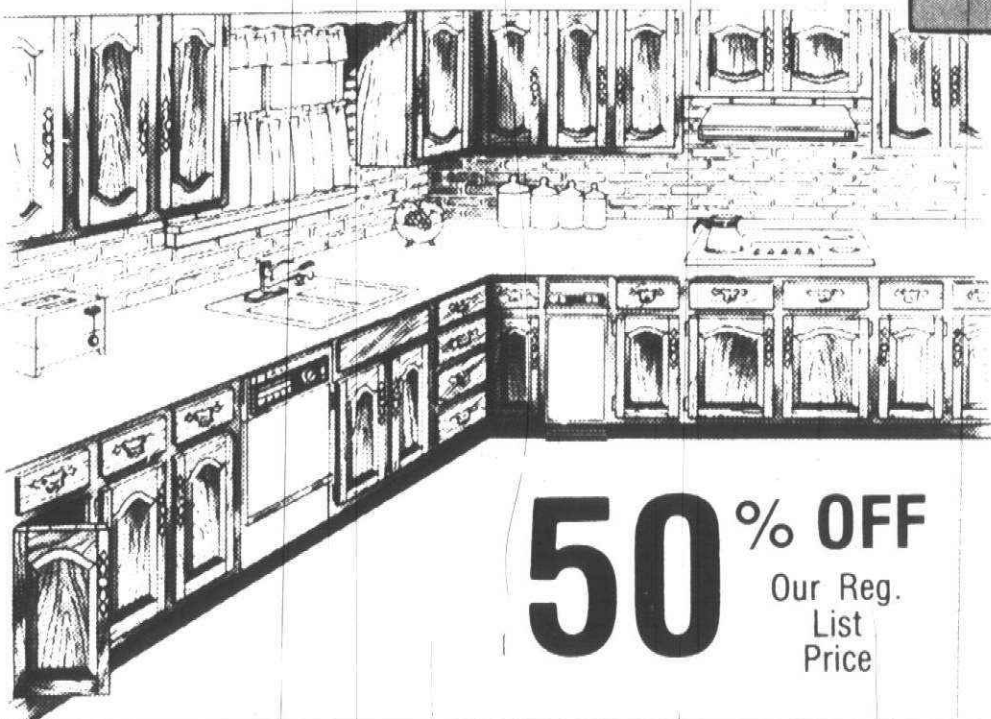

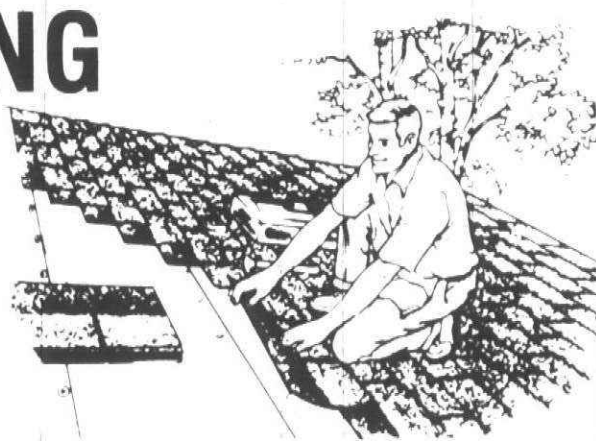

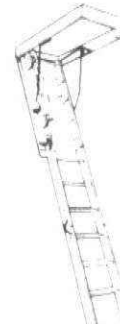

Sandmann answers Doc's questions

(Editor's Note: The following article is a question-answer interview between Observer Sports Editor Dennis O'Connor and Plymouth-Canton Community Athletic Director John Sandmann. The Observer plans to make this column a regular monthly feature.)

Anyone who wishes to ask a question to Sandmann can write Doc O'Connor, Plymouth Observer, 461 S. Main, Plymouth.

The Observer cannot guarantee that every question will be published but hopes to ask as many questions as possible).

Question: Before we ask any questions about the athletic department and its philosophies, I think it would be beneficial to our readers for you to describe some of the duties of your job.

Answer: "My main duty is to direct the entire athletic program for the four middle schools and two high schools in the community. I am also on a steering committee for the health education program at the high school, and I direct the physical education curriculum for grades K-12—looking, evaluating, and recommending staff.

"I also have everything to do with the athletic budget and bids for the equipment we use. There are over 100 coaches for 100 teams, and more than 2,000 kids participating in athletics in the community.

"Some of my duties used to involve coordination of the safety committee and the forensic and debate programs. Now that I am no longer involved with these programs, hopefully I can get more involved with coordinating the physical education curriculum."

Question: What are some of the duties of athletic liaison Paul Cummings?

Answer: "Beside teaching two classes, Paul acts as my assistant at the Park. He sets up all the high school practice schedules and works on the eligibility lists of all the high school athletes.

"Paul acts as a buffer between coaches and myself, and he also attends a majority of the athletic contests in the evening."

Question: Why don't Canton and Salem varsity athletic teams compete against each other on a non-league basis?

Answer: "First of all, when Canton first opened (in 1972), there was a different enrollment between the two schools and a new program was just beginning. We have a different situation here where there are certain intangibles that are not healthy—for example kids going back and forth to

classes, eating together, and sharing the same facility.

"Now that student enrollments are getting closer and the programs are developing into stronger ones, both schools have certain commitments with other non-league schools that I'm not going to break.

"It's not a question of not getting along. In fact, the two basketball teams will play each other in the Christmas Tournament next year at Churchoil.

"I give our schools a lot of credit. I look at other districts and it would have been chaos with two schools and one facility on the Park site. Our people did a super job working together before the second facility was built."

Question: Everyone complains about officials. How do you hire them and are they qualified?

Answer: "Officials are judged under a rating system—approved, supplementary, and general—based on years of experience and rating of the coaches. All varsity contests contract approved officials 1½ years ahead of schedule. Many of the supplementary rated officials work at the junior varsity level because they have to start somewhere.

"There is no league 'black-balling' of officials. However, we have gentlemen's agreements that if one school requests that an official not work its game, then he doesn't work in the league at all. But this doesn't happen very often.

One of the highlights of the meet will be Livonia's Karen Martino, who was last year's National Junior Olympic champ.

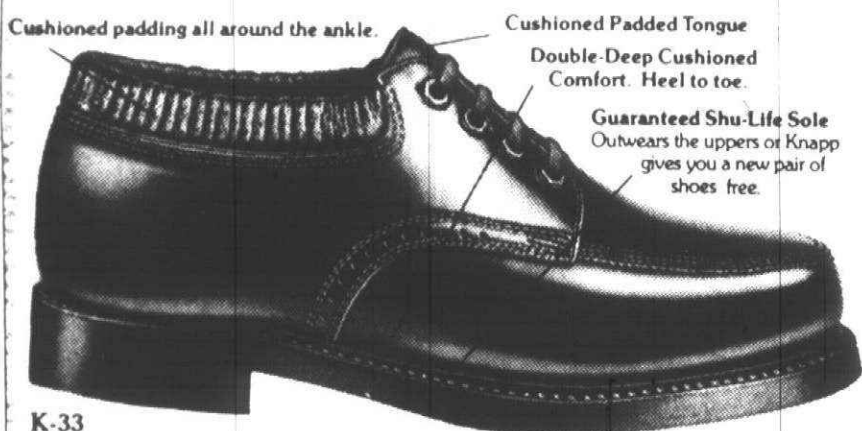
The top two gymnasts in each event will advance to the Junior Olympic National Championships held in Lincoln, Neb.

He has served as a theological consultant to the advisory committee of the American Bishops' Committee on Health Affairs, as a synodical judge, and as a member of the theological commission of the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Fr. Kosnick has lectured widely in the areas of medical and sexual ethics and has published in a variety of journals.
