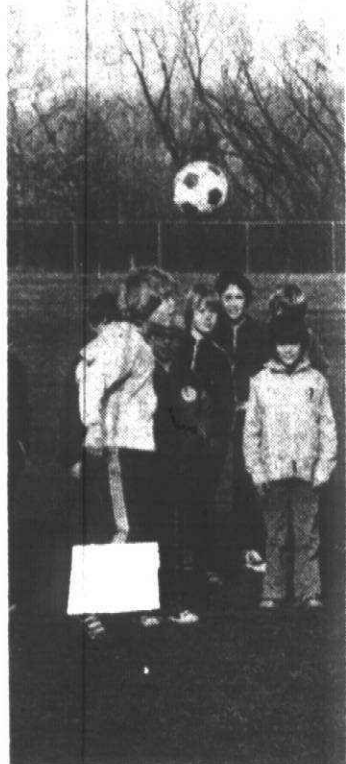

## Fire chief finds unsafe practices in high school

An inspection of Plymouth Salem High School this week uncovered numerous violations of the state's school fire safety code.

Det. Sgt. Patrick Garrity of the Michigan State Police Fire Marshal Division, who made an unannounced inspection of the school Monday, said he found the following safety hazards:

- The electrical fire alarm system was not in operation.

- One-fourth to one-third of the wall-mounted fire alarm pulls were broken.

- Portable fire extinguishers had been removed from glass cases in the hallways and signs had not been put up indicating where they had been moved.

- The auxiliary pump for the automatic sprinkling system installed in the ceilings of the second and third floors did not have sufficient pressure to keep water pumping in the case of a major fire.

Although Garrity did not issue any citations, he said he told school officials to correct the safety hazards.

"IN CASES LIKE this we prefer to cooperate with the school in solving the problems. If we don't get cooperation, then we go to the prosecutor's office," Garrity said.

Garrity made his visit the same day the Observer reported that the fire alarm systems in Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton High Schools were deactivated daily to prevent pranks from setting them off. It was also reported that the fire extinguishers had been removed from their cases in both schools.

Bill Brown, principal of Plymouth Salem, said in an interview that Garrity had informed him of the violations, and steps were being taken to correct them.

"We hooked up the fire alarm Tuesday morning, and we had two false alarms within a couple hours," he said.

Brown also said that the auxiliary sprinkler pump was repaired Tuesday afternoon. Replacements for the broken wall pulls had been ordered and were "expected sometime this week."

Signs designating the location of portable extinguishers were being prepared, he said.

"I have every intention of coopera-

## New church holds services

A new Protestant church that hopes to attract non-church goers of all denominations will hold its second service this Sunday at 10 a.m. in the Plymouth Canton High School cafeteria.

The name "People's Church" was deliberately chosen for the new congregation, Heneveld explained.

"We want to offer to all people an opportunity to worship and rejoice together. We're downplaying our denominational affiliation. We're mainly aiming at the people who haven't been going to church."

Heneveld says his congregation hopes to hold services at Plymouth Canton High School until it can afford to construct a church building.

## Ruling paves way for full-time cops

In dismissing a motion that would have prevented Canton officials from eliminating Police Commander Carl Silver's job, Wayne Circuit Judge Horace Gilmore Wednesday removed a roadblock that has prevented township officials from establishing a 24-hour police force.

Township Supervisor Harold Stein said Silver's lawsuit over the township's plans to eliminate the commander post was "the only thing" that impeded board members from hiring four fulltime sergeants.

Silver wanted a guarantee that he would not lose his position of second in

command in the transition from the part-time force to a fulltime one. As planned, the fulltime force would not have the position of commander. The only supervisors would be the chief and the four sergeants. Silver has not applied for a job as sergeant.

A suit filed by the Canton Police Officers Association (CPOA) over the township board's plans to hire the sergeants outside the ranks of the current police department was thrown out of court by Judge Gilmore last week. The suit was filed by the CPOA on behalf of the department's four part-time sergeants.

Stein expects township board mem-

bers will begin establishing a full-time police department at next Tuesday's meeting by hiring the four fulltime sergeants.

The supervisor said the Michigan Municipal League will begin testing the 28 applicants for 10 fulltime patrol officer posts "as soon as possible." All 28 patrol officer applicants are current members of the part-time Canton Police Department.

ALTHOUGH TOWNSHIP officials had planned to implement the 24-hour police force in January, Silver's outrage at a plan to eliminate his commander's post stymied the expansion

plans. Voters approved a two-mill levy for the expanded police force last August.

Although township officials have welcomed Silver's test for one of the sergeants' posts, Silver has refused "as a matter of principle."

On Wednesday, Silver's attorney—Ronald Egnor—asked Gilmore to rule on his motion to prevent the township from hiring anyone but Silver for the "number two" position. Egnor said the number-two slot could be a commander's post or a sergeant's job.

Egnor tried to establish that Silver holds a "vested right" to the job he has held since 1976. The attorney inferred that the current township administration was attempting to abolish the commander's job for political reasons. Silver was nominated for the commander's post by former Supervisor Robert Greenstein and appointed by the township board.

But Judge Gilmore did not accept Egnor's argument that Silver holds a vested right to the number-two position in the Canton Police Department and dismissed the attorney's motion for an injunction.

"It appears to me there is no contractual basis to grant such an injunction," Gilmore said. "We have a situation here where the township is not restructuring the department but organizing a whole new police department. We're in a different situation than when there are vested rights."

GILMORE ALSO dismissed a motion made by the township's attorneys—Bert Burgoyne and David Berry—to issue a summary judgment that would have closed the Silver's case forever.

Gilmore's ruling on the summary judgment will allow Silver to continue his legal battle against the township in circuit court.

Silver and his attorney said they may ask for a jury trial in Gilmore's courtroom to reinstate Silver as a supervisor in the police department.

## Handicapped get training before school-age years

What might look like play to the untrained eye is a skillfully designed program to help each child develop to their maximum academic, physical and social abilities.

That sentence describes the educational program for the pre-school handicapped child who lives within Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The Infant-Preschool Special Education Program is centered at Farrand Elementary School, 41400 Greenbriar Lane in LakePointe subdivision, Plymouth Township.

THE PRE-SCHOOL center, supervised by Mary E. Nutter, conducted a special program just last week which typifies the kind of services offered to parents of handicapped pre-schoolers.

Rona P. Alexander, Ph.D., appeared to conduct a special workshop on pre-speech and communication skills and to demonstrate feeding techniques for children with cerebral palsy.

Alexander earned her bachelor's degree in speech pathology and audiology from Indiana University in 1971, a master's degree in speech pathology from New York University, and a Ph.D. in speech pathology in 1976 from the University of Illinois.

She has attending several workshops, seminars and practicums across the U.S. on neurodevelopmental treatment approach to cerebral, voice disorders and speech treatment.

The workshop at Farrand April 11 was attended by parents of handicapped youngsters, other interested parents, and staff members.

THE WORKSHOP with Dr. Alexander is just one of many training, informational and supportive activities offered to parents by the pre-school center.

Public Act 198 of 1971—the Mandatory Special Education Act—establishes the right of handicapped persons from birth through age 25 to equal opportunity within the public schools. What often isn't realized, though, is that the Act insures that no child need wait until he is school age before ben-

efiting from special education services.

Mrs. Nutter stresses that every effort should be made to obtain help for the handicapped child at the earliest convenience, whether it be a minor problem such as a mild hearing loss or speech impairment, or a major disability—a crippling disease, birth defect, or a mental impairment.

"Our program is based at Farrand School and serves children from birth to six years of age. Pre-primary special education services are available for the mentally and emotionally impaired, physically involved, those with hearing and vision difficulties, speech and language impaired, and the learning disabled."

The staff is made up of a psychologist, speech pathologist, an occupational and physical therapist, nurse, home programmers, and center classroom teacher.

## Kings Row burglarized

Teenagers are suspected in Monday morning break-ins at two stores in Canton's Kings Row, a shopping center that has seen more than its share of break-ins recently.

A brick was thrown through the front door of the Pizza Bowl to gain entry sometime between midnight and 5 a.m. Monday morning.

Dick Sroschser, manager of the Pizza Bowl, said the break-in must have occurred before 5 a.m. because a baker at Holloway Bakery next door discovered the broken window in the door when he reported for work at that time.

The 7-Eleven store in Kings Row, on Lilley Road, was also broken into during that period by thieves who forced their way through a vent on the roof of the store.

Wayne County Sheriff Det. Robert Anky reports that about \$50 plus coins were taken from the pizzeria register while only \$10 and some tools were taken from the 7-Eleven. Except for the broken door, police said there was no malicious damage on the property.

Because of the age of the children involved the program is developmentally based. Each child is assessed and his functioning levels evaluated within the six broad categories of language, social, self care, cognitive, and gross and fine motor skills.

Options available for parents are a home program with a paraprofessional training the parent to work with the child, home therapy with a trained therapist assisting and providing therapy to the family, center programming—including a pre-school classroom for children ages 2½ to 5 on a ½-day basis or individual center therapy.

If your child has a special problem and lives within Plymouth-Canton Community Schools you may obtain more information by calling the center at 420-0363.

"It appears it was kids in their late teens or early 20s," Anky said. "We've had a few other B&E's in that area lately where tools are taken and they bypass really expensive stuff that they could run off with easily. They bypass valuable equipment like electric typewriters that could be easily sold."

Anky said that a April 11 break-in at J&K Tools, 9175 General Court, Plymouth Township, was similar to the recent robberies. Tools worth \$3,000 were stolen from J&K, but expensive precision tools were left behind while the thieves tried to make off with 50 lb. marble slabs.

"The stuff they're stealing is real difficult to fence unless someone works specifically in the trade," Anky said. "But they'll take something heavy and bulky that's worthless and leave precision tools lying right next to it. There's no consistency."

One of the reasons Anky suspects that young people are involved is that a postage scale was taken which, he theorizes, could be used to weigh marijuana.

## Rich runs 100th in marathon

While the number 100 has a special significance in our society, it means even more to long-distance runner Bruce Rich of 637 Corinne, Canton Township.

Rich, who races with the Great Lakes Track Club, came in 100th in the field of 4,674 in the 82d annual Boston Marathon Monday afternoon.

The 19-year-old Rich finished the marathon in a time of two hours, 26 minutes and 57 seconds, about 16 minutes after the winner. Officially, his was the second best performance of Michigan runners. Steve Flanagan of East Lansing finished 37th.

The 26 mile, 385-yard race was won by Bill Rodgers of Boston. He finished just six strides ahead of Jeff Wells, a divinity student from Dallas. It was the second win in four attempts for the Bostonian, who completed the grueling course in a time of two hours, 10 minutes and 13 seconds.

Because he is only 19, Rich expects to race in the marathon for years.

At least once a month Rev. Al mails out a prayer check list to the faithful that usually includes some kind of "prayer blessed" novelty item.

Persons can check off any one of a number of problems facing them, including "poor health," "financial needs," and "trouble in the home." Every day, letters are brought into the chapel where Rev. Al "agrees in prayer" with your specific request, foundation spokesman explained.

The envelopes are checked to see if they include a \$5 or larger installment on Rev. Al's Health and Happiness Plan.

One of the people regularly receiving literature and trinkets from Rev. Al is George Capps, former Farmington juvenile delinquent, now a confirmed Detroit derelict.

IT SHOULD be noted that Mr. Capps is hardly a devout religious person. The only spiritual experience he ever had was induced by the delicate combination of a controlled substances, a six-pack of Molson's Export Ale and a five-pound sack of Pride of Iran brand pistachios.

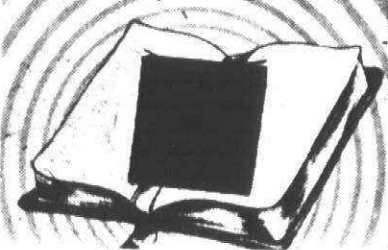
So how did he get on Rev. Al's mailing list? Well, he has a friend named Jack Mingo who thought Capps might get a sacrilegious kick out of receiving the reverend's trinkets. Mingo signed up his friend on Rev. Al's roster under the fictitious name of George Capsize.

And that's the way the computer printout reads when his personalized greeting is delivered.

Over the years Capps has received a multitude of goodies from Rev. Al, who usually informs the faithful, "I am not charging for my prayers, but this ministry does have expenses."

Capps especially treasured the home communion kit that he got. It consisted of a cracker and some grape juice in one of those little packets they

put ketchup in. I swear to God that I'm not exaggerating.

He's received a bar of holy soap identical to those teeny-weeny Holiday Inn soap bars, except this one had a religious labeling.

He's received a mustard seed that would've been planted in the Garden of Olives if Capps had only returned it to Rev. Al along with a \$10 check or money order.

Most recently, the mail-order evangelist saw fit to send "Dearest Brother George" a "beautiful and powerful blessing cloth."

Specific instructions told him to take this holy hanky to the Masonic Temple in Detroit where Rev. Al would be speaking.

The personalized invitation looked like one of those "You may already be a winner" letters from the Readers Digest and quoted Jeremiah, chapter 33, verse 3: "Call unto Me, and I will answer thee, and show thee great and mighty things."

Quite cleverly, the invitation capitalized on the bible passage by telling Brother George to "prove God and claim Jeremiah 33:3 by placing \$33 inside the special envelope... Remember, place \$33 exactly, no more, no less, inside the special prayer blessed envelope. There's a reason for this."

No doubt.

But Brother George overslept on the morning of Rev. Al's Detroit visit. He missed his opportunity to ask Rev. Al in person what was so special about the holy hanky and the holy soap.

Instead, he turned to his journalist friend for help.

After calling Rev. Al's toll-free number and hearing his pre-recorded voice tell me how uptight I've been lately, I slammed the phone down and dialed information to get the regular number of the United Faith Foundation.

Collette stressed that the soap, cloths and mustard seeds are sent at no cost to the recipient and Rev. Al prays equally hard for everyone who asks for his aid, whether they give a donation or not.

The foundation, Collette said, took a cue from the Catholic faith in "offering items to hold in your hand to focus your faith." St. Paul started the tradition by passing out pieces of Christ's clothing to believers, Collette explained.

And, while the Rev. Al doesn't pretend to be distributing remnants of Christ's wardrobe, the principle remains the same, according to Collette: "With God all things are possible."

Collette didn't particularly want to talk about the trinkets the group mails. He wanted to extoll Rev. Al's work in poor countries such as Haiti, where the United Faith Foundation distributes beans and rice to 30 government-licensed orphanages. In fact, he said, the rapport with the Haitian government is so good that Rev. Al is considered a personal friend of that country's dictator, John Claude "Baby Doc" DuVallier.

Figures on Rev. Al's net worth and the amount of money spent on advertising and administration were not at Collette's fingertips. But I didn't press it.

I don't have time to go to California to examine the foundation's non-profit corporation papers. They are probably operating within the confines of the law. It is not illegal in America for a religious huckster known as Rev. Al to prey on the desperate hopes of poor, sick or ignorant people as long as he fills out the proper forms and makes the necessary disclaimers.

And there's not a goddam thing I can do about it except make jokes about his holy soap and home communion kits in the hope that more people will laugh long and hard at Rev. Al's sanctimonious solicitation.

ting with the fire marshal on this matter. All the problems will be taken care of."

Despite the violations, Bron maintained that the safety of the high school students was not jeopardized.

"We have done the utmost for student safety," he said. "I defy any school to come up with a more comprehensive plan to protect students than we have."

Specifically, he mentioned a full time security force, a direct phone line to the Canton fire department, a school-wide public address system and two-way phone communication from his office to all the classrooms.

As far as the decision to deactivate the alarm, Brown said he was a man

in the middle.

"If the alarm is on, the kids will set it off. If we turn it off I have problems with the community. In spite of what I do somebody is going to be unhappy."

Sgt. Garrity, however, said there were ways of providing maximum fire safety while reducing the chances of vandalism and pranks.

## Driver training to begin

## Peanut Spice Cake—An Inviting Dessert

### PEANUT SPICE CAKE

**1/4 teaspoon cloves**  
**1/2 cup margarine, softened**  
**1 cup sugar**  
**2 eggs**  
**1/3 cup molasses**  
**1 cup milk**  
**1/2 cup chopped Planters Cocktail Peanuts**  
**Cream Cheese Frosting (recipe below)**  
**2 tablespoons chopped Planters Cocktail Peanuts**

Sift flour, baking powder, soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves together. Set aside.

Times were different in business when William H. Vanderbilt spouted "The public be damned."

Today, times are different too in public education. Which is why the theme "The Public Better Not be Damned" has been chosen for a conference on school public relations May 5-6.

The PR conference is being sponsored by the Michigan School Public Relations Association (MSPRA) in Ann Arbor. Area school administrators, school board members, and interested teachers are invited to attend.

LEADING THE conference will be the driving force behind the annual Gallup poll of public attitudes toward education.

Dr. Samuel G. Sava, executive director of the Institute for Development of Educational Activities (IDEA) will talk about what he's

learned in nine years of listening to people talk about schools.

Following Sava will be another top business professional who also spends a lot of time listening to people and helping them improve their job performance. Bruce Smith, a motivational trainer from McDonald's Corp., will explain to school administrators "How to Motivate Employees" to make them more aware of the public, and to help them care about their jobs.

JAMES CAUDILL, Benton Harbor Area Schools' director of public relations, has been involved with MSPRA conferences as both an organizer and speaker for the past five years.

"This is a terrific opportunity—at low cost—for school officials to sit down with top school PR planners and experts from private industry to exchange ideas about how to improve communications with school district residents," said Caudill, who serves as secretary for the MSPRA.

A special session on "Why School Boards and Superintendents Don't Get Along" will be presented by Sally Keeler, director of field services for the Illinois Association of School Boards.

**SPECIAL WORKSHOPS** also are planned on elections, surveys, community involvement, citizens advisory committees, publications, crisis communication, anti-voucher campaigns, media relations, internal communication, and closed circuit television.

Registration deadline for the conference is April 21. The fee is \$25 for MSPRA members, \$40 for non-members. The Holiday Inn West in Ann Arbor is the site of the conference, and hotel reservations must be made directly with the Inn.

**STRAWBERRIES BY THE BARRELFUL**  
WE'VE GOT THE BARRELS AND THE EVERBEARING STRAWBERRIES!

Strawberries are just about everybody's favorite small fruit, yet if you want the real mouth-watering strawberry flavor and true fragrance, you must grow your own. Because only fully ripened strawberries are the real thing. This doesn't mean you need a large garden patch or even several 20 foot rows in order to produce a harvest you can grow a respectable crop in a very small area. And as a matter of fact, you can grow them in a BARREL OR WOODEN TUB. There is nothing really new about these methods—people have been growing strawberries in barrels for ages in Europe and, to some extent, here.

You can even grow a crop on a small apartment terrace, provided you have plenty of sun and water and feed your plants regularly. Early spring is the best time to set in a crop of strawberry plants. There are some fine new varieties of repeat-cropping strawberries that give more than one harvest a season. Strawberries are perennial plants, so they will last for years. And you can root baby plants that dangle from runners, using them to replace the parents when fruiting declines in a few years. Further, even between harvests, strawberry planters are decorative assets to your garden.

**BARREL AND TUBS: A WOODEN BARREL IS BEST.** For a metal one is likely to heat up too much in summer's sun and this is bad for plant roots. You can use an old barrel except one that contained pickles, vinegar or sauerkraut. Old barrels are obtainable in a hardware store or shop catering to home-made wine hobbyists, such as American Hardware. Before you use an old one, scrub out the interior with a stiff scrubbing brush and two or three washings of strong detergent, then rinse well. (Salt or other materials might have been in it that will kill plant roots.) Bore a row of 1 1/2 inch holes 6 inches up from the bottom, spacing them 6 to 8 inches apart. Measure first and make a mark where the center of each hole will be, so they will be evenly spaced, for the barrel circumference changes on each row. Make a second row about 6 inches above the first, then a third row, and so on till you reach 4 to 6 inches from the top. Stagger each row of holes so that they center between those of the row below.

In the bottom, bore 1/2 inch holes for drainage—eight to 16, according to the size of the barrel or tub. Then roll the barrel to its permanent site and set it up on three or four bricks to keep it off the ground. Filled with soil, barrels get too heavy to move easily. Cover the bottom with a layer of coarse gravel 3 inches deep. On the top of the gravel center a tall 1 pound coffee can with both top and bottom removed and fill it with gravel or sand. Then fill the space around it with soil, gravel or sand. Then fill the space around it with soil, packing it down till it reaches about the center of the first row of holes.

Trim the roots of the strawberry plants (see sketch) and remove all dead or yellowed leaves, leaving three to six healthy ones. Working from inside the barrel, plant one strawberry plant in each hole till the junction of roots and crown barely reaches the inside of the barrel. Place each plant near the top of its hole to allow for settling of the soil. Spread roots fan-wise, pack soil over them till the hole is covered.

When the whole row is planted, water the soil gently with a fine spray till it is soaked. Let it settle for a few minutes, then with a gentle twisting motion, lift the coffee can until its bottom nearly reaches the level of the soil. Refill the can with sand or gravel, then pack soil around it as before. Plant a row of strawberry plants in the holes at that level. Proceed with planting one row at a time, lifting the can and filling it. When the can top is level with the barrel top, leave the can in place and do not fill the top 4 to 6 inches with gravel.

The sketch of the cut-out barrel shows the column of gravel that has been created through the center of the soil. This will be the place for watering, a kind of "watering column." If you like, you can plant a colorful annual plant in a pot that fits into the can, removing it when watering is needed. Plant a row of strawberries 8 inches apart in the top of the barrel.

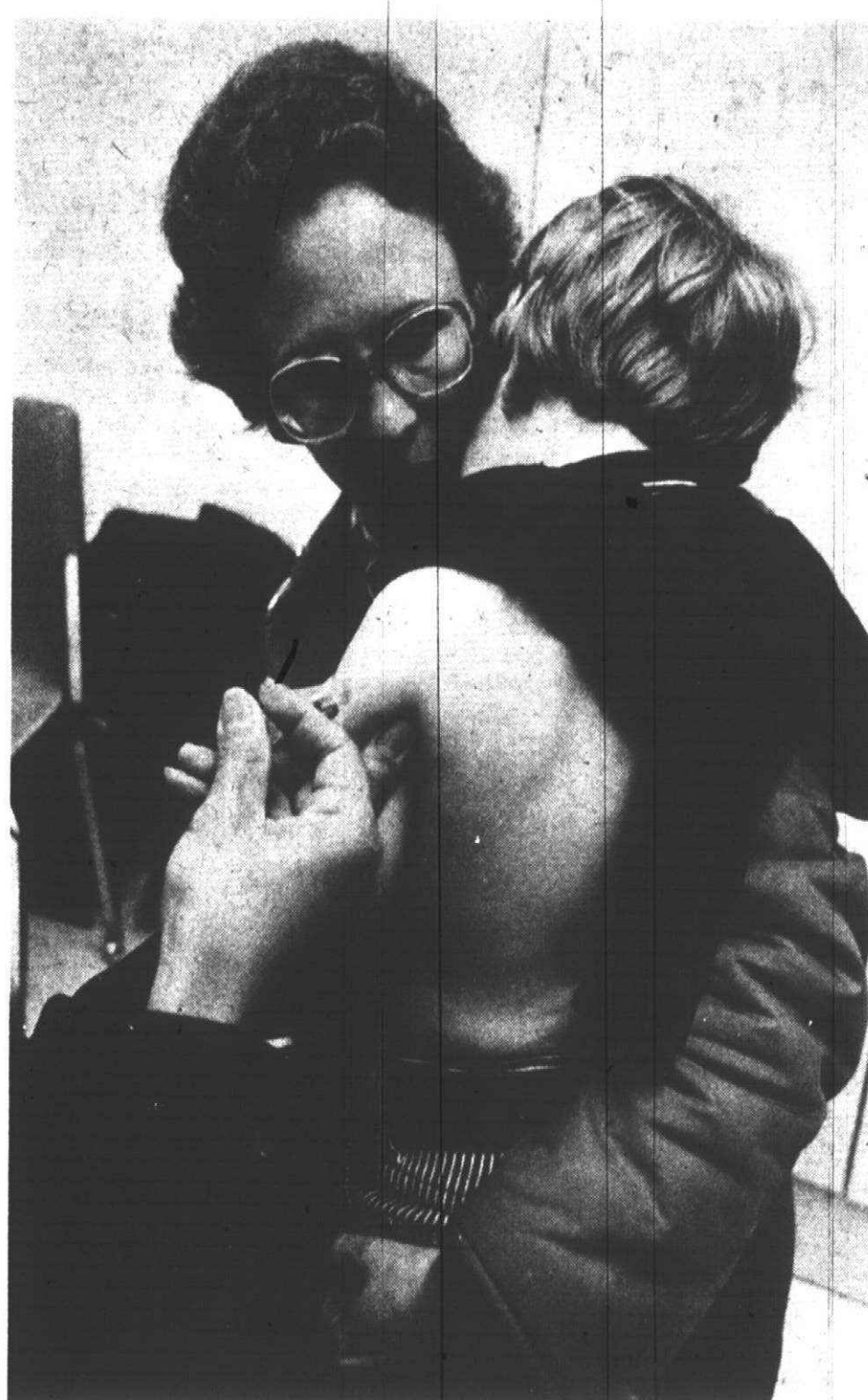

## Public hearing set

# Plymouth to form enticer of development

Plymouth has taken its first step toward establishing a Economic Development Corporation (EDC) to attract more business and industry.

The city commission voted 7-0 this week to accept an application to organize an EDC and to set a public hearing on the matter for May 15.

An EDC is a non-profit organization authorized by the state to sell municipal bonds to finance commercial, industrial or residential development.

The EDC may use bond proceeds to acquire or lease property, renovate or construct buildings. The law provides only one EDC may be formed in each municipality, so any group or individual interested in forming one must petition to do so at the May 15 hearing.

ALTHOUGH THE CITY hasn't received any specific request from a land-holder for EDC revenue bonds, City Manager Fred Yockey said some

interest has been expressed by the owners of an industrial building which has been vacant in the city for many years.

Reportedly interested in working with an EDC are the owners of the former Antaglio Building, a 30,000-square-foot building on Plymouth Road across from Burroughs Corp.

By state law, an EDC cannot be formed unless three residents petition the municipality to do so. That was

done Monday night when city commissioners received a petition from Clifford Tait, Jack Wilcox and William Leonard.

The last discussion of forming an EDC was about six weeks ago when a presentation was made by Charles Burleigh, attorney from Miller-Canfield-Stone—the city's bond counsel.

Mayor Thomas Turner noted the major advantage of the EDC was its authority to sell municipal bonds,

which are attractive to buyers because interest earned is tax-exempt.

"There are no specific proposals for using the EDC now, but I am aware of one building in the city which has been vacant for some time, and there's the possibility the owners may use this mechanism to improve the building and find a buyer or tenant."

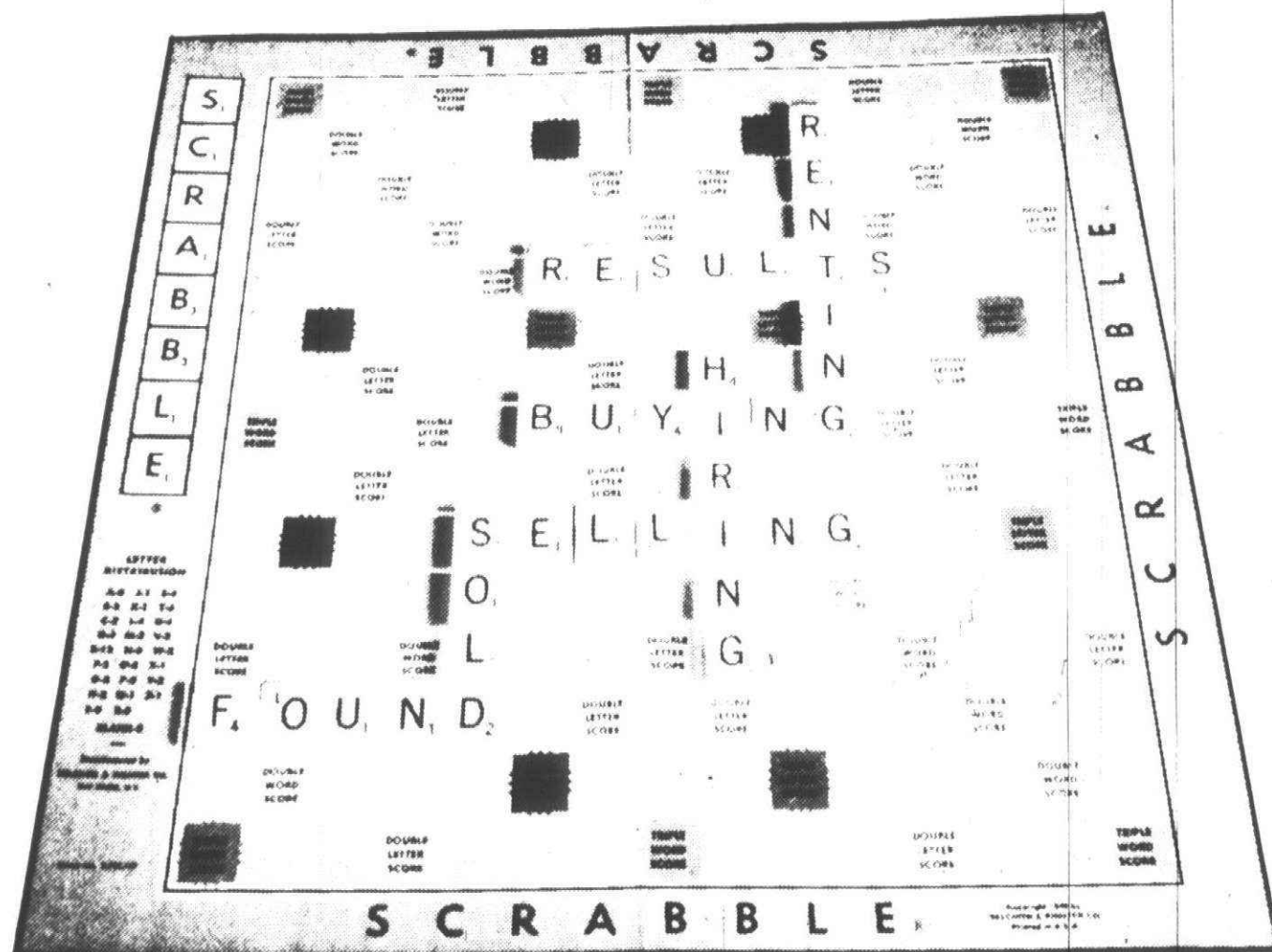
Yockey said the next step will be to ask bond counsel to draft a resolution and ordinance establishing an EDC

and then hold a public hearing on that ordinance.

The city manager added there was no legal liability to the city in case of default of a bond issued by the corporation.

Commissioner Beverly McAninch said she realized there wasn't a legal obligation but asked whether the commission shouldn't consider what the city's moral position be in case of default.

## Smith seeks clean dining

State Rep. Roy Smith (R-Saline), whose district includes Plymouth and Plymouth Township, has introduced legislation to strengthen state health department sanitary standards.

The bill, if passed, would require busboys, waitresses and janitors to use separate rags or other cleaning devices to wipe off chairs, tables and floors.

"By making the health department regulation a law, the public will help see that it is enforced."

It's the state's responsibility, Smith said, to assure public dining facilities are clean.

## Some skills are hard to re-acquire

Discipline is not going fishing today. Or tomorrow, or any day this month. Spring is a time for disciplined people not to do things and for undisciplined people to have a ball.

Not only does good weather allow you to go fishing if you want, but it also allows you to do work outside that you've been putting off all winter—even if you don't want to.

ALTHOUGH I GET the urge this time each year to go fishing, I never do.

Each spring I successfully repress the urge and work instead. The last spring I went fishing was when I was a young boy, about 20 years ago.

In the country, spring fishing came in two stages. First was early spring when the pike started running in the ditches. Time to get out the spears and (when the fish warden isn't around) the flashlights.

Later in April the fish started running in the Cass River. After the spring floods receded, and the water was still running pretty fast downstream—that's the time to head for the banks with line and hook, and a sand-wich.

Fishing off the river banks isn't as easy as it looks. You have to know how to fix up a rig and weight it properly, according to the strength of the river's current that time of year. You also have to learn how far upstream to throw your line so the weight will settle at the proper spot on the bottom of the riverbed. Otherwise your line will drift downstream, and you'll lose more fish than otherwise because it ain't good to haul fish upstream.

Because it has been 20 years or more, I couldn't river fish today if my life depended on it. Besides, my stomach has weakened with age and I just don't have the appetite anymore for suckers, carp and redbellies.

A few years back I took daughter Bridgette to Wilcox Lake to fish off the bank. Fishing off the bank of a lake is a lot easier than river fishing, but I still had no luck. I've lost the touch I had as a kid.

I've only been smelt dipping once, so that variety of spring fishing has no allure for me.

I just think about going fishing—desire, dream, plot. But I won't go,

partly because I've lost the knack and partly because there's so much to do around the house.

INSTEAD I WILL wait until August for a week's fishing in the upper peninsula.

As a fisherman who doesn't fish much anymore, I limit myself to boat fishing on a lake. I now drift-fish for walleye which provides sufficient pleasure, recreation and relaxation.

The thing about fishing for walleye is that they don't hit one after another as in panfishing. So you have a lot of time to collect your thoughts about the meaning of life while you wait for the next hit. Often, I have two or three days to contemplate the meaning of existence.

The other nice thing about drift-fishing is drifting. Even if the walleye aren't hitting, it's still nice to roll with the waves and soak in the sunshine.

The water has a magic attraction—it induces a hypnotic trance—which can cure almost any ailment. That's why I'm thinking about fishing; I need a cure for a pain in my . . .

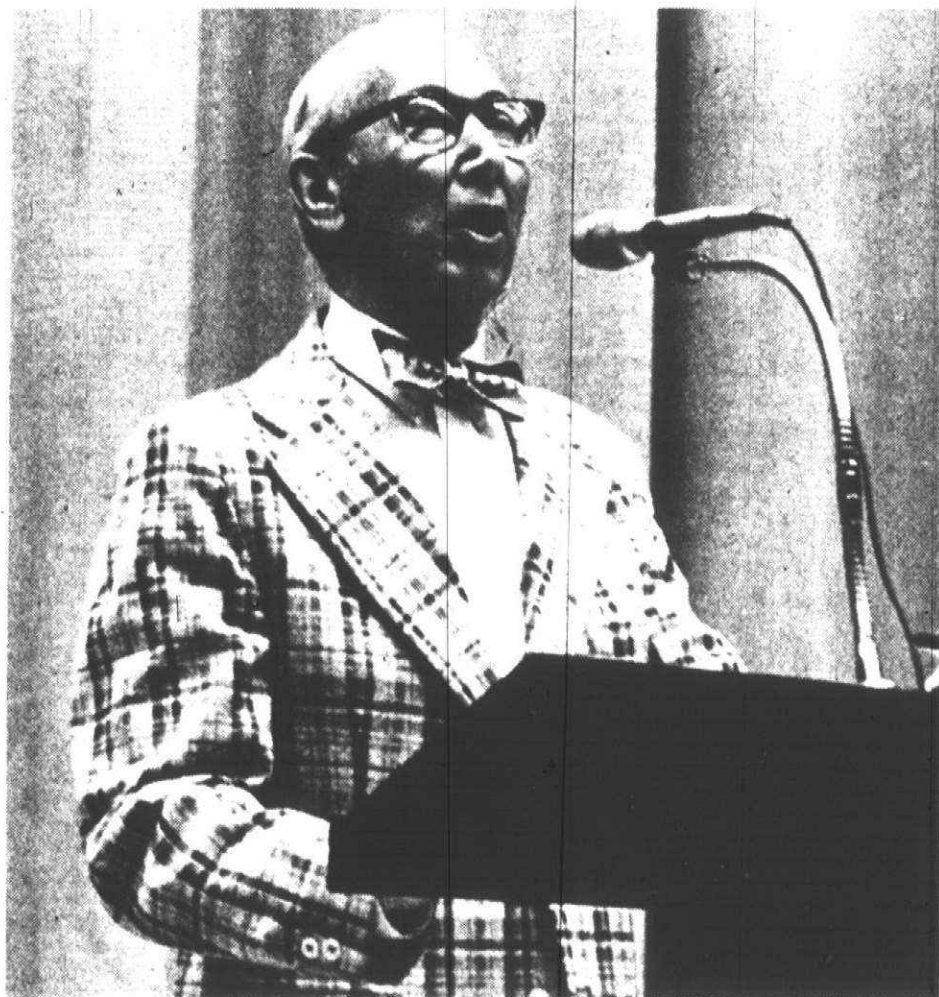

# Bikers lift their lids to repeal helmet law

Hundreds of the motorcyclists who rode through Hines Park Sunday were not wearing helmets.

The bareheaded group was returning home from a noon anti-helmet rally held at Detroit's Kennedy Square under the sponsorship of A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments (ABATE). One thousand riders took part in the demonstration.

ABATE President James Rhoades of Garden City explained at the rally that the cyclists who participated in the protest want more than just the right to let their hair blow in the breeze. Rhoades said the bikers want state legislators to enact mandatory motorcycle education programs to be taken before bikers are given motorcycle licenses.

Helmets, Rhoades maintains, offer little protection at speeds over 10 miles an hour. Travelling faster than that, Rhoades says riders stand the chance of suffering severe neck injuries in a fall when the spine is pressed against a rigid helmet.

Many bikers at the rally said there are times—like a traffic jam on I-94—when they'd gladly don a helmet. But they resent the fact that the state requires them to wear one at all times.

A few representatives from the Libertarian Party supported ABATE in its stand that the helmet law is an infringement of civil liberties.

ASIDE FROM a few people relieving themselves on a statue in the middle of Woodward, the crowd was well-behaved. A helmet was burned in protest during the rally.

For the most part, the motorcyclists got down to the task of becoming a

political pressure group and spent most of the morning learning who their state legislators were.

"Our motto is, 'Let those who ride decide,'" said Vince Consiglio, a Detroit school teacher who serves as the legislative liaison for ABATE.

"People who choose to wear helmets can do so. But if the state really is sincere in trying to make motorcycles safer, they should become involved in rider education and public awareness of the motorcyclist."

"Somebody applying for a license to ride a motorcycle should be put through a whole series of written and road tests. And automobile drivers have to be taught to share the road with the motorcyclist."

"This could be done by public service announcements or commercials. We'd also like to outlaw blind spots in car mirrors so the motorcyclist stands a better chance of being seen. Statistics show the majority of motorcycle accidents are the fault of car drivers. But that's no consolation to the guy who just got wasted on his motorcycle."

Consiglio said 27 states have already repealed the helmet law. Ohio struck down the helmet requirement last month and on July 1 it will be legal to ride without a "brain bucket" in that state, according to Consiglio.

As legislative liaison person for the anti-helmet lobby, Consiglio said his job consists of telling bikers who their state representative is.

"Some of these guys never even heard of the governor," Consiglio said. On the other hand, he said, the movement is expanding from the clubs and ABATE and is gaining support among suburban, weekend motorcyclists.

# Anglers seek river 'mullet'

Bass and trout snobs will tilt their noses skyward at the thought of catching suckers, but there are plenty of anglers in Michigan who appreciate the fighting qualities and taste of the "whistlemouth bass."

Suckers are spawning again in area streams, notably some stretches of the Huron and Clinton rivers.

The experts say to try below dams. Other good spots are deep holes on a bend in the river.

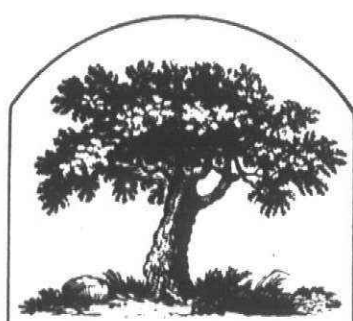
The trick to making suckers palatable is the cleaning process. If, after skinning it, you see a brown streak along the tail, use a sharp knife to slice out the brown meat and discard it. The rest is good.

ONE OF THESE days, you may be eating suckers if you buy fish at the market. Let me bring you up to date.

The Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission in 1976 gave Michigan State University \$97,000 to help develop the market potential for sucker. The ideas: to determine the economic value of the sucker — sometimes called "mullet" — and assess harvestable stocks and processing methods.

Dr. Niles R. Kevern, MSU fisheries and wildlife expert, says processing can remove the bones, odor and taste consumers find objectionable.

Suckers have a 15-16 per cent protein content, comparing favorably to beef (21 per cent) and turkey (25 per cent). Suckers are highly digestible. With a minimal fat content, suckers are low in cholesterol and in most chemical contaminants, such as PCBs, which are stored in the fat.

SUCKERS CAN be used "in products from chowder to sausage, frozen or canned, and baked or barbecued to make sloppy joes," says Dr. Kevern.

When lake trout, whitefish and yellow perch were abundant, commercial fishermen shunned suckers, carp, turbot and sheepshead as "trash" or "rough" fish.

Today the Great Lakes commercial fishery is a severely depressed industry. It's a clear benefit to fishermen and inflation-stricken shoppers to be able to harvest suckers and their cousins.

"We have the technology to transform under-utilized fish into good-tasting, edible products, if we can change consumer attitudes. In taste tests where the participants did not know beforehand what fish variety they were eating, under-utilized fish were entirely acceptable," Kevern says.

THE MORAL is that if you call it sucker, it won't sell. But if you call it fish sticks or mullet or Newyago whale, folks may buy.

Once, when my illustrious bride was ill, it was my duty to make dinner. I skinned a couple of suckers, cleaned them carefully and served them up as northern pike, which can also be pretty boney. Well, to this day, she doesn't suspect, and since she never reads my column, I'm still pretty safe.

Some old-timers like the boiled recipe. You take a big ol' crock and boil potatoes and onions, and maybe some celery and bay leaves, for awhile, then add suckers for the last 12 minutes.

As a fighting fish, the sucker doesn't break water like a rainbow trout or smallmouth bass (though neither does the brook trout or the walleye), but the sucker has plenty of muscle and is good for a battle.

And if the bones bother you, remember the old Pottawatomie Indian saying: "Gitchee Manitou made the sucker boney so that man would be forced to eat it more slowly and savor the meat."

# Blue rate request taking a beating

Blue Cross-Blue Shield's image and its latest rate increase request are taking a beating.

Person after person from across the metropolitan area challenged the Blues' latest request at a state Insurance Commission public hearing earlier this week in Detroit.

Those denouncing the proposed increases, which would primarily be absorbed by senior citizens and single policy holders, were applauded by the more than 100 persons in attendance. Some who testified received partial standing ovations.

Wayne County officials and insurance Commission staff members said the Blues have asked for either a straight 30 per cent rate increase for those subscribers in the "non-group or group conversion" categories or approval of a five per cent increase on reduced coverage for those categories.

WAYNE COUNTY Commissioner George Hart (D-Dearborn), who has zealously campaigned against the Blues' proposal, asked, "What will this hike amount to in dollars and cents?"

As an example, he described a 60-year-old widow who is "too young to receive medicare, lives on reduced social security and works part-time in a Hamtramck bakery."

"She pays," Hart said, "\$574 a year for her policy... If the Blues are allowed to have a 30 per cent increase on July 1, this woman will have to pay \$746 a year for her coverage."

"That's an immoral rate by anyone's standards," Hart said.

THE BLUES also plan to drop comprehensive medical and hospital coverage for 117,000 non-group subscribers and 150,000 former group members who have converted to individual policies.

As a replacement, the Blues will offer three "new options" to the non-group and group-conversion policyholders. The options will offer lower benefits and more out-of-pocket costs.

The plan, according to John Burry, executive vice president for financial affairs for the Blues, would give persons who pay for their own insurance, "a chance to reduce costs for that coverage as much as 33 per cent or increase costs to 11.4 percent."

The major points of the three options are:

★PLAN ONE—The subscriber would pay 20 percent of hospitalization costs and 20 percent of doctors' service charges. He would not pay more than \$400 out of his own pocket for hospital costs for each visit.

• PLAN TWO—The subscriber would be required to pay 30 percent of the costs of hospital charges and 30 percent of physicians' charges. He would not pay more than \$600 in hospital costs for each hospital visit.

• PLAN THREE, billed the "30 Room Allowance Plan"—the Blues would pay \$30 per day toward hospital room charges and would cover other hospital services, x-rays and lab tests for example in full. The subscriber would pay 30 per cent of all doctors' fees.

THE PROPOSALS drew the fire of nearly two dozen persons from around the tri-county area and such affected groups as the United Auto Workers, the United Steel Workers, the Michigan Citizens Lobby and the Detroit Office on Aging.

P. Blaine Marrin, 72, of Rochester,

said, "They're going after the old people first. Why? Because they're the most vulnerable."

Southfield residents George and Dorothy Zuchal, both retirees, joined the chorus opposing the Blues. They said, "We're being picked on. We're just retirees trying to live on a moderate amount of money."

Burry said the Blues had decided to drop comprehensive coverage for the non-group and group-conversion policyholders because rates had not kept pace with costs. He said the Blues were losing good medical insurance risks—the young who are less likely to use their benefits—tocompeting commercial companies whose rates are not strictly controlled by the insurance commission.

"WITH THIS never-ending spiral of costs going up and better risks dropping out, the price of insurance is going so high that the only people who can afford it are the sick," he said.

Even though the elderly protested the loudest and longest, the Blues were also rapped by younger policyholders.

# A chance to influence school budget

Next Thursday residents will have the opportunity to vote on the size of the operating budget for the coming fiscal year for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Voters will be asked to approve two ballot propositions—the first for 4½ mills, the second for ½-mill. Proposition I includes a 3-mill renewal and a new ½-mill levy, each to be levied for five years. Proposition II asks ½-mill for 10 years to pay for building maintenance and improvements.

The effect of both propositions is a two-mill increase (\$2 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation), or \$50 a year for the owner of a house worth \$50,000.

**THE MILLAGE PACKAGE** is being promoted by the school district as a "maintenance" proposal because almost all the revenue it would produce would be spent on existing programs.

The added two mills won't finance any new programs, except for a possible proposed improvement in school bus service by eliminating double-tripping. The 1½ mills will be used to pay for the increased costs caused by inflation and by growth—an increase in enrollment this fall of some 850 students. The half-mill for the first year will pay for boilers at two elementaries, and window air-conditioners for four buildings which now are on a year-round school schedule.

For the next fiscal year, which begins July 1, the two mills will generate new income of almost \$1.2 million of which about \$290,000 will be earmarked for building maintenance.

The three-mill renewal represents some \$1.7 million in income which already is being collected. Thus, defeat of the three mills would represent a loss in operating income of almost \$2 million.

**THE OBSERVER** urges its readers to vote "yes" on both ballot propositions.

We believe it makes sense to earmark income for building maintenance to make sure roofs are repaired, faulty boilers replaced, pavement resurfaced, etc. We have watched maintenance items trimmed from the budget, year after year, because it's easier to trim mortar than people. The assets of the school district need to be protected with planned repairs and replacements. The half-mill earmarked levy will make this more likely.

We also believe 1½ mills are needed to maintain existing programs. It will cost more money when the doors open next fall to 850 additional students. The impact of student growth and inflation is a 14 per cent increase in the operating budget. The 1½ mills is a reasonable price to pay for growth and inflation.

The school district has put together a modest, conservative millage request. That request gives you the opportunity to vote on maintaining good schools and protecting rising house values. You have an investment to maintain in your schools and in your home. We urge you to protect both investments by voting yes Thursday, April 27, on both ballot propositions.

## Net cost of tax

The two additional mills being requested by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools won't cost as much as you might think.

That's because you can use get a state income tax credit for your local property tax. The size of that credit varies, according to individual incomes, age, and amount of property tax. But this example is typical for many taxpayers:

Consider the owner of a \$50,000 house with a combined household income of \$26,000. This year the total property tax was \$1,340. If the homeowner is 65 or older, he receives a \$430 credit on his income tax. If the homeowner is less than 65 years of age, he receives an income tax credit of \$258.

If voters approve the two added mills on April 27, that homeowner would pay \$50 more in property tax the first year the millage is levied. But his income tax credit would be \$288, or \$30 more than if the added two mills weren't levied. Thus, the homeowner only pays a net increase of \$20 instead of \$50.

Think about what you actually will pay, and then vote "yes."

# Soccer, pro and prep, draws new, young crowd

In the old days, a young man aspired to be captain of his high school football team because it was a sign of manhood and there were always many female admirers vying for his attention.

Football, as we know it, is purely an American game, and when people from other countries talk about "football," they really mean soccer.

Soccer has made great strides in our country in the last several years. It's an action game, the rules aren't too complicated, and you don't have to be a big hulk of a brute to play it.

Where several years ago it wasn't even a high school varsity sport, we now have intra-city and inter-city youth soccer leagues, and every year more and more people are playing the game.

Today in some high schools, the captain of the soccer team is a more sought-after position than the captain of the football team.

**PROFESSIONAL SOCCER** has now come back to Detroit. We had a team a decade ago, but it passed into oblivion because of lack of spectator interest.

The new Detroit Express team opened its home season last Sunday in the Pontiac Silverdome and drew more than 28,000 spectators. Apparently it only takes 15,000 to 18,000 spectators a game to break even, so if the first game is any bellwether of things to come, the team should have a successful future.

For spectators, soccer has a lot of appeal over other professional sports.

The game has two 40-minute halves.

Because there are few timeouts, a regular game doesn't last more than two hours. It is continuous action from the time the starting whistle blows, with no delays between plays.

The soccer field is a little longer and a little wider than a football field, and it takes a darn good athlete to keep running up and down that

field for 40 minutes at a crack. There are very few substitutions in professional soccer.

It's not as violent as football, and the players look smaller because they are not wearing all the protective equipment that football players have to wear.

**IN THE OPENING** game Sunday, the audience was different from the normal pro football crowd. It was made up of families with a heavy representation from the younger set. Because it has not been a sport of the older generation, the kids seem to have a better grasp of the game.

The Express had won their first two games on the road, so you would have expected the spectators to be all hepped up. Instead, they were quite quiet. Those 28,000 persons don't make much of a dent in a huge, 80,000-seat stadium, and the quiet was almost spooky.

An organ played throughout the game, which was distracting, and that also covered up the fans' outbursts. It reminded you of a roller skating rink.

Unfortunately, the home team lost a close battle but fielded a fine defensive team. Let's hope the English striker whom the Express has acquired for the latter part of the season will add that offensive spark that will make their first season a winner.

Detroit is a great sports town, and it deserves to have all professional sports represented here. But new sports survive only when fans support them.

# Study sneezing for a safer America

driver for lunch. Yes, there was an accident.

There are more tales from other police authorities about bee stings, distraction in lighting a cigarette, love-making, et cetera. They all are unspoken votes for a congressional study grant.

**IF YOU'RE ONE** of those who wonders why you get those sneezing attacks shortly after awak-

As far as I know, the sneeze has yet to benefit from a philanthropic appropriation for scientific research. However, I hope you agree that it's a subject which merits deep consideration, particularly a study of the sneeze as a traffic hazard.

If you're not a chronic sneezer yourself, or if you're not married to one, the ritual of a resounding series of sneezes may be foreign to you.

The real problem is with the person who lets go with a hearty sneeze while behind the wheel of an automobile barreling down the expressway.

**MOST PEOPLE**, so it is said, close their eyes when they kiss. There's a school of thought which says this allows participants to create a better image of those they would rather be with, but damned if I'll believe it.

All people close their eyes when they sneeze.

If you don't think so, try keeping 'em open next time you pop out with one of those explosive exhalations.

This is where the sneeze ties in as a traffic hazard. Scoff if you must, as some police officials do in a chuckling sort of way. But if this study doesn't deserve a federal subsidy (under my direction), what does?

**DR. MILES TAYLOR**, a clinical professor at Wayne State University's Medical School, told me a few days ago, "There's a half-second or so when a sneezing motorist is almost completely incapacitated."

This, again, is because of that involuntary reflex which causes the eyes to shut.

"If a driver feels a sneeze coming on, he should take some precautionary action," suggested Dr. Taylor, who specializes in nose ailments.

His advice is to slow down and grip the wheel firmly, being sure that forward movement is free of obstruction.

Most popular methods of inhibiting a sneeze are by pressing a finger against the upper lip, or rubbing the tip of the nose. I've tried both and at best they only delay the inevitable.

**CHARLES WILMOTH**, police chief of Garden City, doesn't know Dr. Taylor from second base. Yet Wilmoth told me, "If I anticipate a sneeze while driving, I'll take my foot off the gas, slow down, and get ready to brake."

He admits he never has heard of a sneeze being used as an excuse for an accident, but concedes "it probably has happened."

Rochester Chief Robert Werth had a smile in his voice when he said, "I've heard of plenty of strange situations, but I've never come across that one." The point is, he didn't say it couldn't happen.

Chief Timothy Ford of Plymouth turned scholar, as is his wont, and lost me when he started using words like culpability. After talking about feet per second, time consumed by a sneeze, and what constitutes a voluntary criminal act, he veered to snapping turtles.

It seems that when Tim was chief cop at Gibraltar, these guys were driving home from fishing the Detroit River. A snapping turtle in their catch got loose, crawled into the front seat and wanted the

ening. Dr. Taylor says you probably are afflicted with vasomotor rhinitis. That means there's a swelling in the nose membrane due to a chemical change.

Personally, I have a theory that when snoring ceases, sneezing begins. When I mentioned it, Dr. Taylor himself turned snorer.

Then he told me how to bring on a sneeze.

Look at a bright light and blink your eyes. That's all. If you feel the urge developing, look at a bright light, blink, and faster than you can say ker-choo, you'll experience the violent expiratory effort desired.

In an era when do-it-yourselfism prevails, it can be suggested that automotive sneezers equip themselves with a kit which would include: a) a light bulb; b) a long extension cord; c) an automated forefinger for lip pressing and nose rubbing.

It's this corner's contribution to the cause of highway safety.

# Child care center idea gets a welcome partner

A few months ago a suggestion was made at a public hearing conducted by the City of Plymouth that federal dollars be used for a child care center in the city.

Specifically, the suggestion was to use Community Development Act (CDA) funds to construct and operate a day care center.

Because of the suggestion, money was "allocated" in the second year of a five-year program for use of CDA revenue. The allocation of the money was exactly that and no more. It did not mean that a single dollar would be spent toward development of a child care center. The allocation merely expressed on paper an indication that the suggestion would be investigated the following year.

And next year could arrive, and a decision be made to "re-allocate" the money into the third or fourth year, or drop the suggestion entirely.

**IT'S NOT THAT** nobody in city hall cares about whether a child care center is established, or even studied.

That's just the way the CDA program works. There are many ways to spend the federal dollars, and so the suggestions go onto a shopping list and remain there. The most needed, or the most feasible, projects get off the list first. Other projects stay on the list, though, which are needed and might be feasible. They stay on the list because there's no one with expertise in city hall to convert the idea into a workable project.

This especially is true in the case of the child care center idea. What's needed is someone, or some group, committed to the idea with some expertise to get the suggestion off the shopping list.

Until now, there hasn't been a group or individual demonstrating an interest in pushing for the child care center. But this month's newsletter of the Plymouth, Northville, Canton League of Women Voters has changed the picture. The newsletter notes that the LWV's Plymouth chapter has agreed to "work toward the use of community development funds for a child care program for very young children."

**WITH THE LEAGUE'S** involvement, there is a chance the item will get off the shopping list.

The LWV is capable of doing the kind of research which is needed to determine if the need exists in the city, and how great is that need. If the

need exists, it also has the potential to draw upon experts in the field to garner enough information to demonstrate whether such a facility is feasible.

So with the league's involvement, the idea of a child care center should move off the shopping list. It could move by becoming a workable project, or move by being dropped because either the need doesn't exist or because there's no practical way to put together such a project.

The Observer congratulates the Plymouth branch of the LWV for taking on the project. We hope it works hard in this endeavor, and be ready in 1979 when the next public hearing is held on how best to spend community development funds.

## Transit sense

Eleven years ago, the seven-county Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) was created to consolidate all public and private bus systems into one and to bring to the region some version of rapid transit.

Since then, certain elected politicians have behaved as if they, not SEMTA, were calling the shots, as if SEMTA were their toy.

Only after SEMTA itself seemed to be coming apart at the seams did the politicians come to their senses. Last week, Detroit Mayor Coleman A. Young, whose bull-headed insistence on as many miles of expensive subway as possible for Detroit alone almost wrecked SEMTA, said, "Let's let the experts do their jobs and not hamper them with political pre-demands."

Young, finally, is absolutely right. We hope those suburban politicians who have bull-headedly opposed any subway will rise to the same level.

Let SEMTA do its job. If its sophisticated, computerized analyses show the region needs one block, one mile or 20 miles of subway, then that is what should be built.

The facts are that downtown Detroit has traffic and construction problems that may require some subway, but a subway costs 10 times as much per mile as surface rail rapid transit. The "political pre-demands," as Young aptly dubbed them, have caused years of city-suburban poison. Enough. Let SEMTA do its job.

## Speak up now about Ford Road

Editor:

Your chance to have a say about future improvements to Ford Road is coming soon.

The department of state highways and transportation has scheduled a public meeting on the proposed reconstruction of Ford Road between I-275 and Venoy Road. It will be held at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 27 at the John Glenn High School auditorium.

As a businessperson or resident of Ford Road, it is most important for you to attend and have input at this public meeting. A good turnout of local people assures the highway department of the need for prompt consideration of the various proposals and timely determination of the final course of action.

The departments have several alternatives under consideration. The first alternative is to do nothing other than normal maintenance and some safety improvements at intersections.

There are two other alternate plans. One would widen the road to five lanes, the other to seven lanes. The five-lane project, with right turn lanes at major intersections such as John Hix, Newburgh, Wayne and Venoy roads, would require taking 27 feet from either the north, south or both sides of the existing Ford Road right-of-way except where there already is sufficient right-of-way (between Imperial Highway and Wayne Road and between Linville Road and Carlson Street).

The center lane of the five lanes would be reserved for left turns.

Between 10' and 20 feet of open space would be allowed for safety purposes between the roadway and sidewalks.

The right-of-way required for the seven-lane alternative would be about the same as for five lanes, except there would only be about eight feet of open space between the curb and sidewalk. Additional right turn lanes would not be required.

Both construction plans include an overpass over the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad between I-275 and John Hix with several variations to the type of overpass.

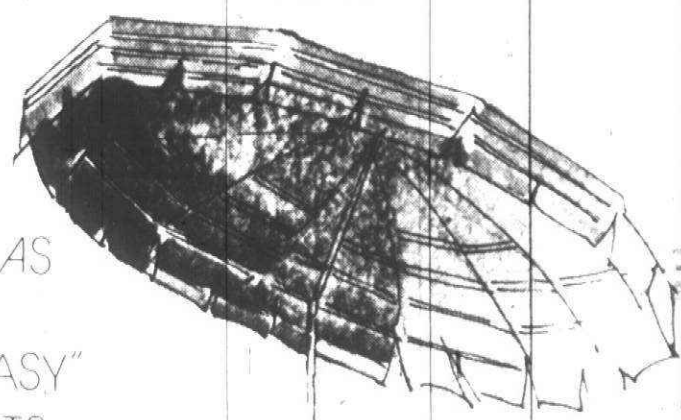
In addition to the 8 p.m. public hearing on April 27, there will be a "pre-hearing" from 4-8 p.m. April 20 in the council chambers of Westland City Hall (on Ford between Wayne and Newburgh roads). The pre-hearing is an informal walk-through display with department personnel present to answer any questions.

Both the pre-hearing and public hearing have been scheduled during evening hours so that as many persons as possible may attend. All of the Ford Road community will benefit from improvements to the road since I-275 accessibility will be enhanced.

We sincerely urge all who are interested in or would be affected by the reconstruction to take the time to attend the April 20 and (or) April 27 meetings.

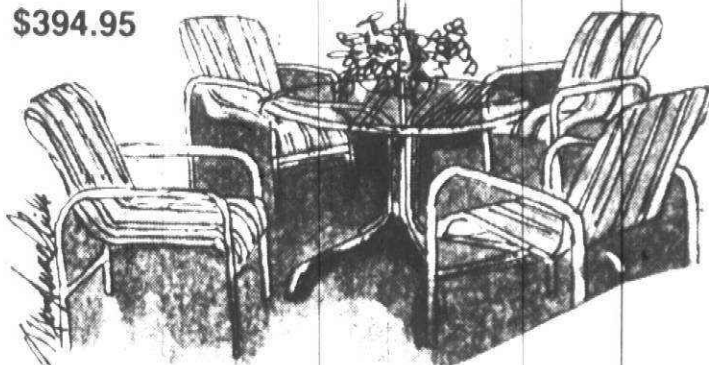

## Left turn lanes are road hazard

Editor: It has come to our attention that a hazardous condition exists at the intersections of Ann Arbor Road and Main Street, Ann Arbor Road and Lilley Road, and Ann Arbor Road and Haggerty Road. Namely, left turns from Ann Arbor Road to the other streets. There isn't enough time for the volume of vehicles making left turns. The obvious solution would appear to be a delayed left turn signal system. A left turn lane does exist at these intersections indicating to motorists that reasonable precaution or planning does exist to effect a safe left turn. Because of the left turn lane there is a high volume of left turning traffic, and the current signal time allows only two to three vehicles to turn left. Usually, the third car makes the turn against crossing traffic.

The Plymouth Community Civitan Inc., a community service club, is interested in not only normal service club improvements but also in better conditions for our citizens. To this end, our entire club membership supports an indepth feasibility study of delayed left turn lights at these intersections. Please consider this and forward your recommendations to the proper authorities.

ter" earned a second and her "Iridescent Autumn" was third. Dorene Lawton's "Skiing in Colorado" received honorable mention.

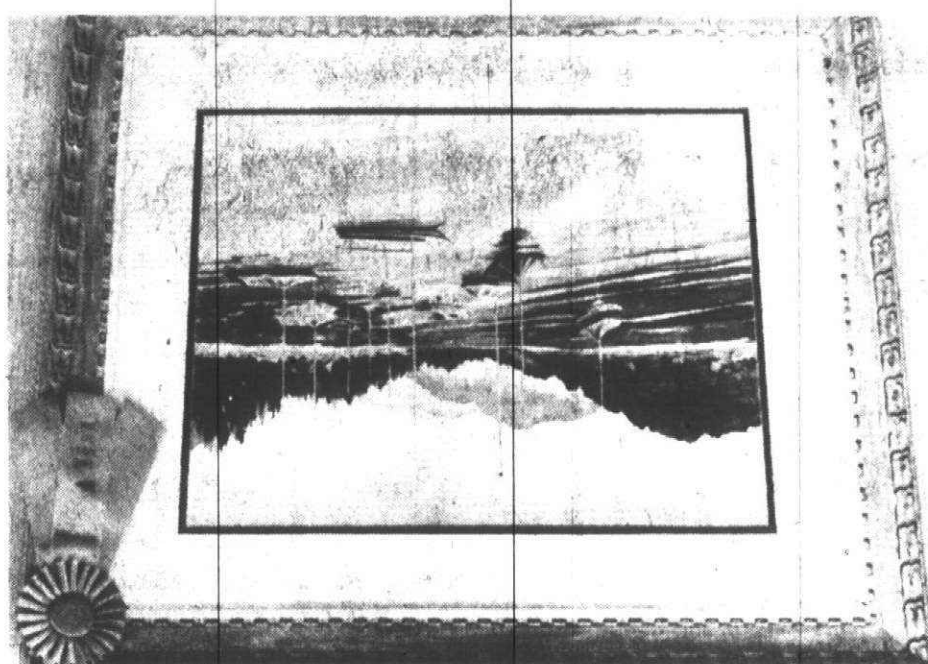

She was Livonia's first female police cadet at age 18. She applied for the cadet job before graduating from Livonia Stevenson High School in 1973.

Since then, she earned an associate

degree in law enforcement from Schoolcraft College where she was on the dean's list. She completed police academy basic training at the Criminal Justice Institute in Detroit. She also completed Army basic training and is a member of the U.S. Army Reserve.

She attends Mercy College of Detroit where she is a senior majoring in forensic science-crime lab technician. Once she completes her degree requirements as a crime lab technician, she hopes to work in a crime lab and specialize in toolmark and ballistic identification. But those are long-range plans.

She had to wait for her 23rd birthday to become eligible for the police officer job. Her birthday was April 14 and she started her new duties April 17.

"**THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS** that I am proudest of are becoming Garden City's first female police cadet and then being promoted to police officer," said Lisa Dougherty.

inactive for the rest of the year because no one can be found.

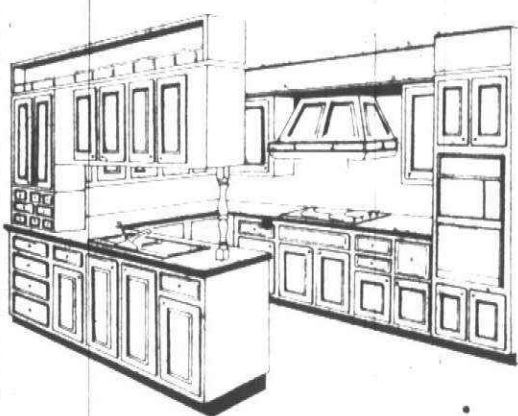

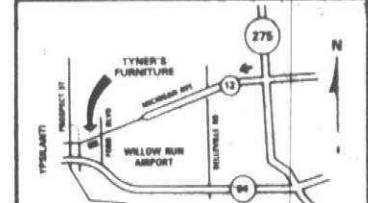

## Serenade

### A man and his violin are not soon parted

When such notable guest conductors as Arturo Toscanini and Leopold Stokowski ascended to the podium of the Radio Symphony Orchestra in Rome in the 1940s, it was Gino D'Alessio who served as their concertmaster par excellence.

A violinist and impresario in his own right, D'Alessio now delights diners with his "magic violin" at the Benchmark Restaurant in Southfield's Michigan Inn.

"It was always an exciting experience," D'Alessio says as he recalls those days with the noted conductors. "But when it was Toscanini who was conducting, the mounting tension was both electrifying and terrifying at the same time."

"He was so meticulous that prior to each performance he would have any musician suspected of not getting a musical score quite up to his perfectionist standards come forward and play it solo for him."

D'Alessio, better known as Gino and His Magic Violin, has come a long way since those days. But his own beginning is a story in itself.

Born of musical parents in New York's lower Manhattan, he moved with his family to Italy when he was only 6 years old. Not long afterwards, a carpenter friend gave him an old violin.

BY THE TIME he was seven, young Gennara (his real name) had obtained a book on how to play the violin and was teaching himself. There were no violin teachers in town, but in time a teacher from another town heard him play. Impressed, the teacher paid for D'Alessio's expenses at the Conservatory of St. Cecilia in Rome.

There he studied under Franco Antonioni and

Mario Corti. Later, he studied as a scholarship student under George Enesco and as a contemporary student of Yehudi Menuhin.

Obviously a child prodigy, his progress was so outstanding that in time he earned doctorate degrees from both the Conservatory of St. Cecilia and that of George Enesco. With his extensive knowledge of the history of music, music appreciation, theory and harmony, arranging orchestration, conducting and composition, he was soon on concert tours to London, Paris, Vienna, Madrid, Monte Carlo, Trieste, Bombay and Italy.

When he returned to New York City in the 1950s, he met Josephine D'Anna of Wyandotte, who was studying music. They were later married and in 1962 moved to Wyandotte where they raised two children. She also became an opera singer with the Detroit Opera Company.

CLASSICAL music was always D'Alessio's first love, but he also found himself in Hollywood. There he played background music for such film classics as "Summertime in Venice," "Three Coins in the Fountain" and, more recently, the music of his friend Nino Rota in "The Godfather." He also has played for such stars as Ingrid Berg-

## Sap's on! It's syrup time

Once upon a time—as legend has it—an Indian squaw was preparing venison in the clear sap from a maple tree. During the cooking process, she allowed the sap to boil down and it formed a sweet syrup which her husband found delicious.

From that time on, the Indians used maple sap and syrup extensively as sweeteners, eventually passing their secret on to the early pioneers.

The legend does not say whether the squaw's tribe was one native to Michigan, but as a result of her discovery Michigan is the fourth leading producer of maple syrup in the United States today.

Maple trees produce sugar during the summer months. Some is used

immediately in the growth process and some is stored for use during the winter months. As the days begin to warm, in late winter or early spring, the sap in the trees begins to move, picking up some of the stored sugar along the way.

THIS IS "harvest season" for Michigan "sugar bush" owners and maple syrup producers.

The sweet sap is gathered by drilling holes into the trees and inserting a "spile" or spigot which allows the sap to drip freely into a container attached to the "spile." Sap from the individual tree containers is usually collected by hand, poured into a gathering tank and transported to the sugaringhouse.

There the sap goes into an evaporator where it is boiled down into pure maple syrup. When the sap is running, the collecting and boiling process often goes continuously 24 hours a day.

Sap gathering, or maple sugaring season in Michigan, brings with it the promise that spring is on the way. The season usually begins in late March, continuing through April and climaxed with two tasty festivals at Vermontville and at Shepherd (April 28-30) and everybody is welcome.

May 9, 2:30 p.m.—"Copland in Perspective" with Paul Osterhout analyzing Copland's contributions to American music.

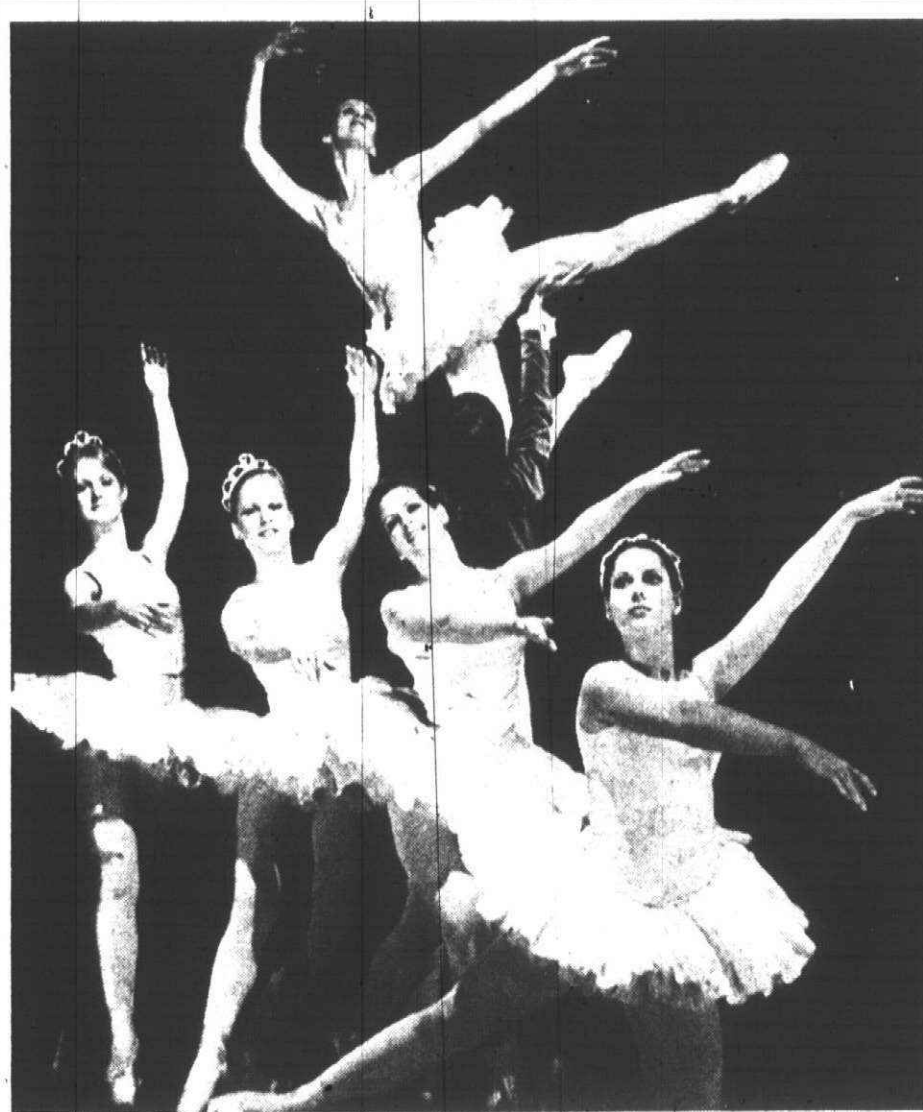

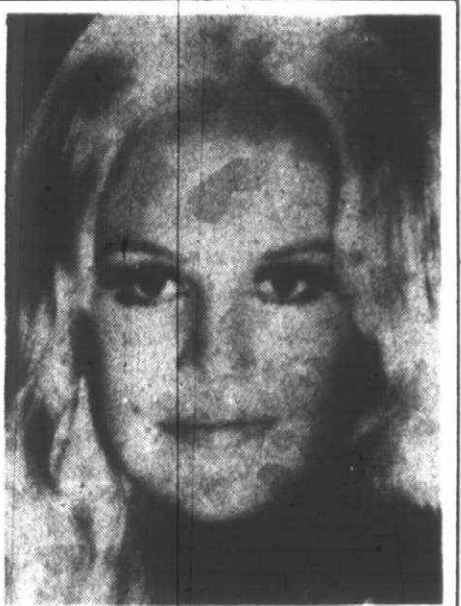

man, Rita Hayworth and for the wedding of Tyrone Power and Linda Christian.

A collector of rare violins, he has 10 of his own, including a 1665 Francesco Ruggeri, a 1741 G.B. Gaudagnini and a 1869 Eugenio Praga. In addition, he owns an old Italian mandolin and a 200-year-old Kimball piano. He also plays guitar and has taught all these instruments in the Wyandotte adult education program and in private music lessons.

His favorite composers include Mozart, Vivaldi,

Bach and Paganini, but he can play almost any kind of music you might request, from classical to pop, from gypsy to show tunes.

No matter what type of music he plays, Gino and his lilted violin are far more than entertaining—for some it may be a spellbinding experience. And he has the charisma to go with it, even kissing the hands of women in the audience in the traditional European manner.

D'Alessio has been the musical director and conductor of the ensemble at the famous Greenbrier Hotel in West Virginia, as well as other leading hotels in Europe and America. He also is violinist

with the Windsor Symphony and is making a record entitled "An Evening at the Benchmark with Gino D'Alessio and His Magic Violin."

While some music may sound like little more than noise, Gino continues with the sounds that have never lost an audience. Not surprisingly, he has been held over at the Benchmark by popular demand.

Perhaps it is the "magic" of his virtuoso flare that draws the people. Or maybe audiences recognize something embodied in the motto of one of his former teachers: "Musica est imago animae," or "music is the image of the soul."

## Salem JV cage coach picked

## Bell heads Canton program

Craig Bell has been selected as the new Plymouth Canton varsity basketball coach. He replaces Casey Cavell, who resigned last month after starting the Canton program five years ago.

"I am very pleased with the selection," said Canton principal Kent Buikema in his announcement Monday morning. "We are replacing a good coach with another good coach."

"I see a lot of dedication in Craig Bell. He has been waiting for an opportunity to be head coach, and I'm sure he'll hop on this opportunity and be successful."

Bell, 32, a native of Northville and graduate of Eastern Michigan University in 1968, has been a basketball coach in the Plymouth Canton school system for eight years. He's been the Salem junior varsity coach for six years.

The physical education teacher in Centennial Park program knows some of the current Canton players through his classes, but admits he will be busy this spring getting to know all the players.

"I know most of the starters who are coming back," Bell said. "I scouted them when I was at Salem. I know all the kids by name and face."

Bell already has plans of competing in the Melvindale Summer League and will plan various "concept nights" during the summer to learn the strengths and capabilities of his new players.

Bell is already talking about a conference title.

"I expect us to be very competitive in the tough Western Six League," Bell said. "My turn has come to be a head coach and I'm ready to put the time into the program to make it successful."

"I will have a time-commitment oriented program. I think the kids are ready and want to put the time into the program with a new coach in the system."

Bell said. "It's my job to see they make the commitment to the program."

BELL WAS selected by a three-man committee which included Buikema, Plymouth Athletic Director John Sandmann, and Plymouth Athletic Liaison Paul Cummings. Although they reached their decision Friday afternoon, it wasn't released until Monday morning.

Five other applicants were interviewed for the job—Canton junior varsity basketball coach Wayne Weimer, Canton freshman basketball coach Dave VanWagoner, Canton varsity girls basketball coach Mike McCauley, Salem freshman basketball coach Pat Cunningham, and health education teacher Bob Blohm, who assisted Thomann last season.

Although Weimer was upset he didn't get the job, Buikema felt the best man was selected.

"It was just my feeling that of all the candidates, Craig stood out," Buikema said. "The caliber of all the appli-

# Ex-Plymouth resident visits area

## Hill sees boom in youth soccer

Soccer means more to Gordon Hill than just a bunch of men in knee pants booting a ball around the Astroturf with their knees and noggin.

The former Plymouth resident now lives in Clearwater, Fla. and serves as color commentator on WTOG in St. Petersburg on 10 road games played by the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

But, more important, he says, is his role as director of youth and community development in the Tampa Bay organization. Hill has taken it upon himself to promote youth soccer in the state of Florida and, for that matter, the rest of the United States. He believes Americans can be stars in the sport if they are given early support and training.

This comes as no surprise to

Plymouth residents who remember Hill as an educational consultant in the federally-funded CASTLE program—an acronym for the Center for Advanced Studies to make Teaching and Learning Exciting for students, "or something like that," Hill explained.

Hill was also instrumental in introducing youngsters in the fundamentals of soccer through coaching. Hills helped set up the Western Suburban Soccer League with Chuck Skene, director of Plymouth parks and recreation commission.

"In those days I was trying to get soccer introduced to American youth," Hill said Sunday in the broadcasting booth. "And now I come here today and see hundreds of young people playing down on the field in exhibition games held earlier this afternoon. The

response has been tremendous. I see soccer has arrived with a vengeance. Youth soccer is going great guns."

Hills moved to Clearwater, Fla. two years ago when he became a professional referee in the North American Soccer League. Last year, after refereeing a game in Tampa Bay, Hills said he was approached by the team management and offered a dual job in the organization—color commentator and youth director.

Hills snatched it up quicker than you kick a soccer ball.

He had broadcast experience from his days in English radio. And in the states, Hill kept his hand in media work.

What was Hill's professional assessment of Sunday's game between the Rowdies and the Detroit Express?

Well, he would have liked to have seen a better game. Detroit lost the game 2-1 after a Detroit player accidentally put the ball in the opposing team's net.

"It was a poor game, but you can't plan that can you?" Hill said.

When accolades are passed out at the conclusion of the league season, a special award should be given to Tom McKay and his Goebel team for its part in one of the most heart warming charities in the area—providing leader dogs for the blind.

Early in the season when the charity plan was conceived, it was felt that, properly presented, the program would provide two dogs, each of which would cost approximately \$4,000.

Now, with only two more exhibitions to go, the leader dog fund has reached \$11,281, and chances are favorable that it will exceed \$12,000 when the team appears in Niles May 6-7, with shows in two different houses.

The fund was almost assured of going over the top last Sunday when \$2,356 was raised at Luxury Lanes, where a capacity gathering watched the bowlers perform.

The program is a joint venture with the Leader Dogs for the Blind school in Rochester. The dogs are highly trained to help sightless persons.

The program calls not only for the purchase of the dog, but also training for the recipient. That's what raises the cost to \$4,000 per dog.

So successful has been the program that it is certain to be continued next bowling season. It is the most unique in the country.

A RECORD TURNOUT greeted the

bowlers as they opened the metro-Detroit city tournament over the past weekend at Satellite Bowl.

When the final pin had fallen, Howard Britton's team from the Dearborn Elks was out in front with a handicap score of 3,284. This was just nine pins better than Carle Scoral's ABC Trophies rolled.

The Elks team had an actual pin count of 2,828 and the Redford combination fashioned an even 2,900.

SOMETHING AKIN TO A RECORD was set at Woodland Lanes during the past week when Roger Wolfram rolled a 705 series. The series was not unusual, but it was one of the few reg-

istered this season by a member of a senior citizens league.

To crash the 700 barrier, he linked games of 235, 242 and 228.

BOB ROSE, who has been bowling at a great rate in the past few weeks, survived a real close battle to win the pace-making role in the Little Caesar's Classic at Westland Bowl.

He put together games of 226, 210 and 225 for 661 and a four-pin margin over Bob Schonde, who posted a 658 on counts of 210, 254 and 193. Jerry Cole Sr. wound up in third place with a 648 that came with a closing game of 233.

## Farber shows them all

Even an uncanny streak of bad luck can't slow down Michigan's champion woman harness horse driver, Bea Farber.

Farber, the holder of Wolverine Raceway's track record along with the state of Michigan's fastest mile ever and the world record for a woman's mile, is used to having things go her way, but recently has had to demonstrate her ability to cope with adversity.

Farber and her husband-trainer Charlie are in the process of moving from their rented farm in Brighton because the property is being subdivided and a new road has been built right over what used to be their training track.

Under normal circumstances there would have been plenty of time to get settled into their new farm near Fowlerville, but the harsh winter and wet spring prevented the Farbers from completing work on their new home and training track.

The result is a pair of trainers with a 19-horse stable who don't have a track to train on. Mechanically-minded Charlie Farber was quick to find a solution.

"I looked around at some of the local tracks and found that they were all in terrible shape, so rather than

putting the horses on a bad track I went out and bought an equine treadmill. Our stable has been getting exercised on a machine," he said.

In-the-know horsemen scoffed at the idea that such a machine could keep race horses in peak condition. The Farbers were even a bit skeptical at first, but the results have been striking.

In 10 starts to date, Farber has finished first four times, second three times, third twice, and fourth once, a record that no one at Wolverine can come close to matching.

Among her recent string of wins was a 1:59.1 victory with her 6-year-old gelding Quick Candy that currently stands as the fastest mile of the year in Michigan.

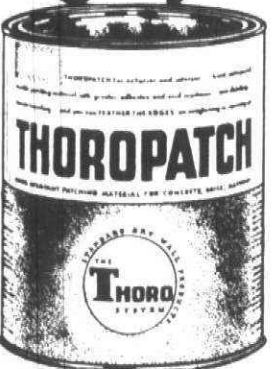
Farber is not unfamiliar with such fast times. She has 32 under-two-minute-miles to her credit over a driving career of eight years.

In that short span of time Farber has captured more than a million dollars in purse money and chalked up 355 trips to the winner's circle.

She was the first woman to drive a horse under two minutes on a half mile track, with Easy Ivy in 1973, and was the first woman ever to win a driver's championship at a major track.

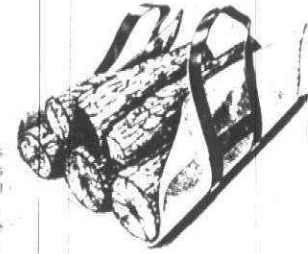

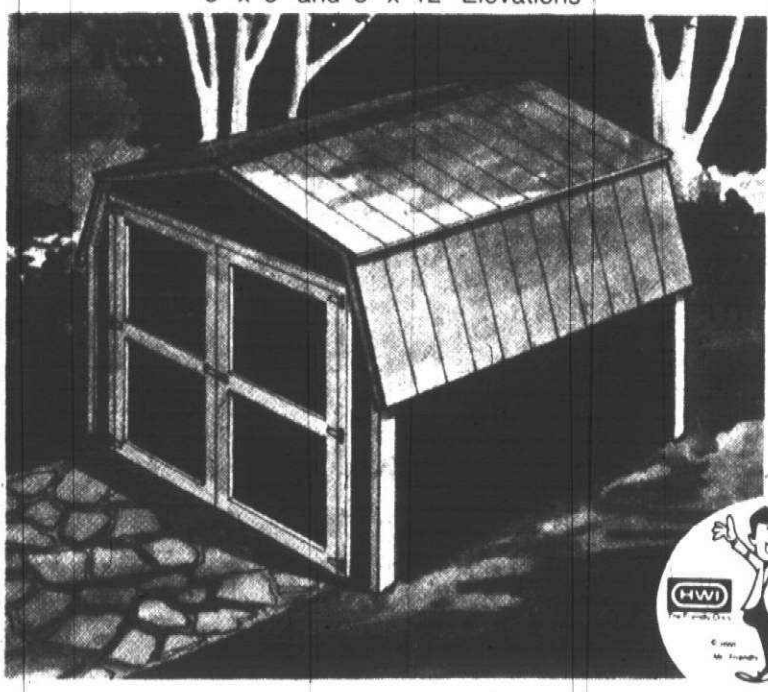

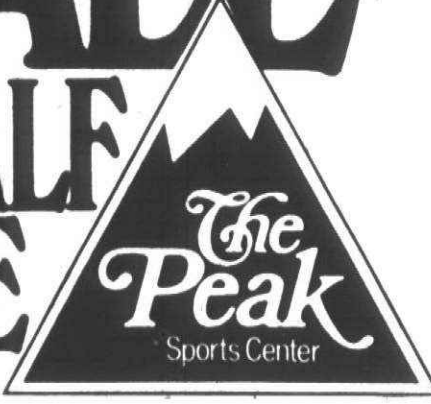

# Jews in area to begin Passover April 21

Passover, the commemoration of the liberation of the Jews from slavery in Egypt will take place from sundown Friday, April 21, to sundown, Saturday, April 22.

In area Jewish homes, the event will be celebrated with a feast called the Seder. Reform Jews have a single Seder which takes place on the first

night. Conservative and Orthodox Jews have two Seders, on the first and second nights.

Throughout the Seder, matzah, or unleavened bread, is eaten instead of leavened bread to recall the hurried flight from Egypt. It left no time for the bread to rise before baking.

According to the Bible, on the night

before the exodus from Egypt began, each Jewish household ritually slaughtered a lamb. So a roasted lamb bone is one of the ceremonial foods at the Seder.

Another food consumed is maror, a bitter herb, usually horseradish, to remind participants of the bitterness of slavery. Haroset, a sweet mixture of chopped apples, nuts, cinnamon and wine, is supposed to soften the bitterness of the maror, and also symbolizes the mortar used by the Jews in the building work they did as slaves in Egypt.

FOUR CUPS OF WINE are drunk during the Seder. Each time the cup is raised, a prayer is recited which also serves as a toast to life, to peace, to freedom, to Jerusalem.

Traditional, but given varied significance, are the roasted egg and green vegetables such as parsley or lettuce served dipped in salt water, offering a reminder of the renewal of spring.

A special cup set in the center of the table is reserved for the prophet Elijah, who in Jewish tradition is the messenger of God appointed to herald the era of the Messiah. There is a place in the service where the door is opened and Elijah is invited in.

The word, Passover, refers to the 10th plague brought by God on the Egyptians when the Pharaoh wouldn't let the Jews go free. The angel of death slew every firstborn Egyptian son, but passed over the homes of the Jews.

RABBI MARTIN GORDON of the Livonia Jewish Congregation calls Passover the oldest of Jewish festivals and the first national commemoration. In addition to marking the passage of a people from subjection of a foreign

Fr. Hubert is a Marianhill missionary who came to Dearborn from Bavaria in 1839, and has been active in several churches.

tyranny to national and religious independence, it is a festival of spring, he says, "when the world of nature awakens to life, growth and fruition."

"It marks, too," he added, "the springtime of a nation whose people

passed from the darkness of bondage to a new life under a law which was ultimately to serve as the foundation for the whole structure of modern society."

"Like so many other facets of Jew-

ish life and experience, the Passover, though Israel's unique possession, is universal in message. The spirit it conveys testifies not merely to Israel's sufferings and redemption, but to mankind's greatest need—freedom."
