

Drug snitches sing to save their skins

When a narcotics officer uses the word "do," he isn't talking about your hair style.

Normally, the word "do" means take action. But, to a narcotics officer, "do" means making an arrest. And when narcotics officers talk about the worth of an informant, they talk about how many people that informant can "do."

"We might pick a guy up for dealing a relatively small amount, or he's referred to us by the detectives after being picked up for a string of B&E's," explained Lt. Alfred Laatz, chief of the Wayne County Sheriff's

Met's Squad. "A lot of them say right off, 'I don't want to go to jail, I want to help myself.' That's the term they use."

"So, we say to them, 'Who can you do?' If he agrees to work with us, we'll still secure a warrant on him so we have a hammer if he gets cold feet later on in the game."

Contrary to many people's preconceived notion, the police get the best of the arrangement between narc and snitch.

An informant is only useful as long as he's producing solid information or introducing undercover cops to high-level dealers.

IF HE PERFORMS his job well, the

informant may get charges against him dropped or reduced, or he'll be given probation after his conviction, according to Laatz.

The judge, not the police department, makes that determination, Laatz added.

"The court makes us establish an informant's reliability," Laatz said.

lent crimes—like breaking and entering or sale of small amounts of drugs—are given a chance to negotiate a plea or are paid for information.

And, Laatz says, it is "strictly verboten" for a narcotics officer to hand over guns or drugs to an informant.

Some of the demands informants make on the police are surprising, Laatz said.

Many are disappointed they can't sample the pick of confiscated drugs. Others try without success to obtain new identities or get a handgun from the department for "protection."

IF THOSE goodies are prohibited, then what's in it for the informant?

Up to \$250, depending on the amount of drugs involved, or the risk taken by the informant.

Once an informant starts introducing narcotics officers to dealers or making drug buys under surveillance, he becomes a "special employee." Although not on the weekly payroll, informants are issued Wayne County payroll checks when they come through for the police.

Those attracted to inform out of revenge aren't used, says Laatz.

Landfill forced to clean up act

Workers at a Canton Township landfill last week averted a lawsuit threatened by the Wayne County Health Department over standing contaminated water and other conditions that violated the Michigan Solid Waste Act.

Labeling conditions at Woodland Meadows Landfill a "potential health problem," health officials threatened to file the litigation and ask the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to revoke the landfill's license.

But Michael Andrews, assistant director of the health department's Division of Environmental Health, said conditions at the landfill on Hannan between Michigan and Van Born had improved when he inspected the facility a week ago.

Andrews said his department will not pursue legal action against Woodland Meadows because landfill workers eliminated state law violations by the April 20 deadline.

WHEN HEALTH officials inspected Woodland Meadows on April 13, they found uncovered refuse, blowing papers and a large pool of contaminated standing water where refuse was being deposited.

Although Andrews said the conditions did not pose an immediate health hazard, he said uncovered refuse and standing water could attract rats.

"During this (April 13) inspection, I was chagrined to see the existing conditions at the landfill site," Andrews said in an April 14 letter to the regional manager of Woodland Meadows' parent company, Waste Management, Inc.

"In the past, the Woodland Meadows Landfill was one of the better-operated landfills in Wayne County. After review of the other landfills in the area, we now find that Woodland Meadows is one of the worst-operated landfills in Wayne County."

Andrews blamed the landfill's management for allowing the violations to occur.

"We advise landfills and tell them how to correct situations," he explained. "But Woodland Meadows is a big operation, and they shouldn't just rely on us. They should have their own preventative measures."

BUT RAY KELLAS, manager of Woodland Meadows for the past two years, objected to Andrews' harsh assessment.

He noted that workers at the landfill pumped the standing water into drainage ditches, covered the exposed

refuse and picked up the blowing litter by the April 20 deadline.

He said water accumulated on the landfill's property because of the spring thaw.

Andrews said the landfill's success in eliminating the violations will prompt his department to look more

favorably on a proposal of Woodland Meadows to dispose chemicals on the site.

The Wayne County Health Department must submit a recommendation to the DNR on new developments proposed by landfills.

"When you get into a situation like

they had at Woodland Meadows, we couldn't even consider the chemical operation," Andrews said.

The health department official said Woodland Meadows is one of the few landfills in Wayne County with the correct geological conditions to build a chemical disposal site.

Silvers seeks 90-day leave

Carl Silvers, at the center of controversy over police department hiring practices, has requested a leave of absence while he fights his demotion in court.

Silvers said he expects to file for a jury trial soon to try to protect his job as the department's second-ranking command officer. His position is due to be dropped when the department becomes full-time in the next few months.

"If the court case comes out in my favor, I'll be back," Silvers said Monday.

Silvers failed last week to convince Wayne County Circuit Judge Horace Gilmore to issue an injunction forbidding his demotion without going through a civil service hearing.

The dispute revolves around Silvers' job title, and what that signifies. Until last winter, Silvers was publicly identified as "commander." Now he is classified as "coordinator" of reserves.

"People in the department still called me commander but recently (Township Supervisor Harold) Stein started calling me 'coordinator,'" Silvers explained.

Silvers alleged in court that the title change was an effort by township officials to deny him due process by declaring his job to be different, lower than the one he believed he held.

Attorneys for Canton Township argued that Silvers was never commander. They said he was always part-time coordinator of the part-time reserve police force.

IT IS SILVERS' contention that he was commander of the reserves when the department was made up entirely of reserves. When the reserves attained certification, Sil-

vers maintains, he became commander of both certified and reserve officers. And, Silvers said, he has the badge and pay scale to prove it.

Silvers contends his job as commander was effectively eliminated by Stein, after Silvers, then acting police chief, refused to fire Stein's predecessor, Robert Greenstein, from the police force.

Stein denied this allegation in a court deposition. He said last week that Silvers was given a commander's badge because there were no "coordinator" badges available.

Silvers' coordinator job will be cut for "economic reasons," Stein said.

Silvers said that he needed a leave because "my position and my authority with the police department are untenable and will remain so until our mutual disagreement is settled in the courts."

"Secondly, and equally important, (that) my wife and children are in need of the attention and time of which I have been forced to deprive them (of) the last two-and-a-half years."

In his letter to the township board, Silvers says he hopes the township administration can reach a "mutually agreeable solution to our present dilemma."

He also states that he hopes the indefinite leave of absence will not hurt his position, tenure or seniority in the department.

If the court case takes longer than 90 days, Silvers would like the leave to be extended. If it takes less than 90 days to settle, Silvers says he'll be back sooner.

Township officials are expected to consider Silvers' request next week.

Greenstein hedges on job

"There's no story behind it," former Canton Township Supervisor Robert Greenstein explained when asked why he submitted an application to be one of 10 full-time Canton police officers.

"We were told by our lawyer to file an application for full-time employment. So we did. That's all there is to it."

The former township supervisor reportedly earns more than \$50,000 a year as an attorney in Livonia.

Greenstein said he could, if he desired, juggle both jobs.

"In law you can control your schedule," he said. "But I can't make a decision until I'm offered a job. I can't give you a credible answer right now. The settlement on how we're to be hired hasn't even been reached."

Greenstein served as township supervisor and Canton's first police chief while he was in office.

When Harold Stein was elected supervisor, Greenstein was removed from the position of chief of police and replaced for a time by Carl Silvers.

He continues to work as a part-time certified patrol officer on the Canton force.

Greenstein said he and fellow officers are weary of the delay in implementing a full-time police department.

The delay was caused by Canton a dispute between the Canton Police Officers Association (CPOA) and the township board of trustees over tests candidates have been asked to take. While officers have agreed to take a psychological exam this Saturday morning, they are fighting a civil service exam, a physical exam and an agility test that is being required of all applicants.

To end the dispute, Greenstein supports a proposal that would allow Police Chief Walter MacGregor to

rank the candidates and hire the top 10.

In an earlier meeting, Greenstein said, all officers indicated they would agree to abide by the police chief's final decision.

What if the police chief didn't select Greenstein, who scored highest among Canton officers in the police academy?

"I would agree to it," Greenstein said. "I think that overriding every other issue, we need a full-time police force on the street today."

"I'd much rather not be the chief's choice than see this thing drag on for five more months. If I wasn't selected, I'd continue to work on a part-time basis."

Township Clerk John Flodin admits that the idea of letting the police chief select the 10 full-time applicants was mentioned, but Flodin said it was never suggested as a serious proposition.

"The board, frankly, never dis-

cussed it," Flodin said. "It would be real difficult to tell the person ranked 11th that he didn't make it because the chief didn't want him. It would put tremendous pressure on the police chief."

4 sergeants hired

The part-time Canton Police Department is on its way of becoming a full-time force.

The township board Tuesday accepted Police Chief Walter MacGregor's recommendation to hire four top-scoring applicants on Michigan Municipal League tests as full-time sergeants.

Trustee Robert Myers was the only board member who voted against the appointments.

Myers favored hiring only three full-time sergeants. The trustee said the township should leave one sergeant's position vacant to offer to former Police Commander Carl Silvers if he pursues and wins a lawsuit that would reinstate him to his second-in-command position.

Silvers' command position would be eliminated under a police budget submitted by MacGregor and approved by the township board. Only MacGregor and the sergeants will hold supervisory positions.

Last week, Wayne County Circuit Judge Horace Gilmore dismissed a request by Silvers' attorney to place Silvers in the second-command slot. Gilmore's ruling, however, will not prevent Silvers from requesting a trial in circuit court over his demotion.

Expected to take over the sergeant positions on May 8 are Jerry Cox of Belleville, acting police chief in Sumpster Township; Westland Ptl. Dennis Jaker; William Lennahan, Jr., of Sylvan Lake, a U.S. customs officer; and Larry Stewart, a Garden City police detective.

Near Canton's border

Space World plans announced

The construction of a \$42 million amusement theme park revolving around space and its environment has been announced by officers of Space World, Inc.—a Livonia based firm.

The complex is to encompass 400 acres at I-94 and Whittaker Road in Ypsilanti.

Principles of the firm include Philip Austin of Livonia, president, and Frank X. Austin of Plymouth, second vice-president.

THE PLANNERS OF the theme park are confident that the project will provide a continuing flow of amusement, entertainment, and education in the world of space for all age groups.

The project is being headed by a team of planners expert enough to insure success of the park within its first year of operation.

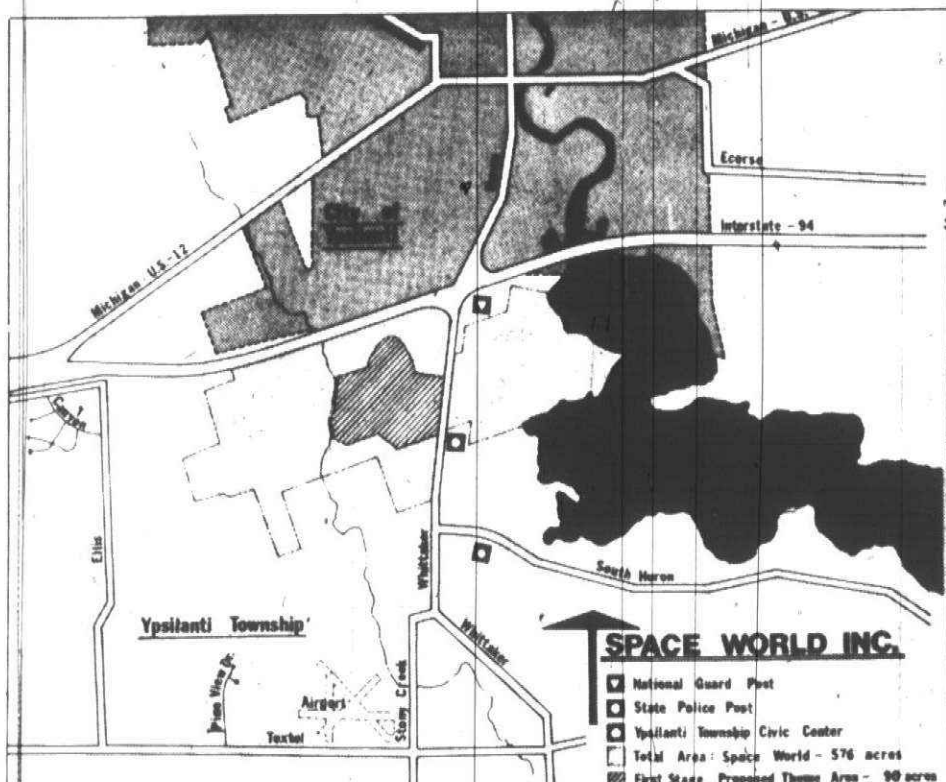
Based on a 121-day season (May through October) projected attendance in its first year is conservatively estimated to be between 1.3 and 1.8 million visitors.

Phil Austin, a space enthusiast, has been involved in a number of projects associated with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), and was at one time in training for the astronauts program. He holds a master's degree in astronautics from the California Institute of Technology.

The theme park, now in its developmental stages, is expected to open in 1980. It is being planned to allow visitors to physically participate in true-to-life space experiences.

Children from two to 102 will be able to experience the sensation of zero gravity, cosmic disorientation and rocket launchings. Visitors will be able to go for a lunar buggy ride—herebefore reserved for foreign dignitaries visiting the U.S.

For UFO buffs a museum will present continuously updated material on

UFO sightings as well as historical "blue book" information.

Another unique feature will be the lunar colony experience, where families will be able to "live" at the lunar resort hotel, where they will have to "suit up," learn how to grow food, walk on the moon surface, and eat astronaut style.

FRANK AUSTIN reveals that the park planners have the full support of NASA, the Lunar Science Institute, the National Space Institute, and other prominent government, space-related agencies.

Space World has retained Barton-Mallow—builders of the Pontiac Silverdome and other major projects in Michigan—for construction and construction management.

The operation and cleanliness of the park will be patterned after the Disney

World concept. Other internal managements also are being planned in the Disney style.

Employment generated in the state in the initial phase of the theme park opening promises to be about 1,100 jobs. This does not include jobs generated by hotel facilities, restaurants,

concessions and other spin-off industries.

While Space World, Inc. has been incorporated in Michigan since September 1976, it has existed in the mind of Phil Austin for seven years. His dream is on the brink of becoming a concrete reality.

THE FIRST STAGE of development will include about 40 acres of parking and 25 acres for the theme park itself.

The second stage will include an additional 18 acres for parking, 14 acres of support facilities, and 26 acres of theme area expansion.

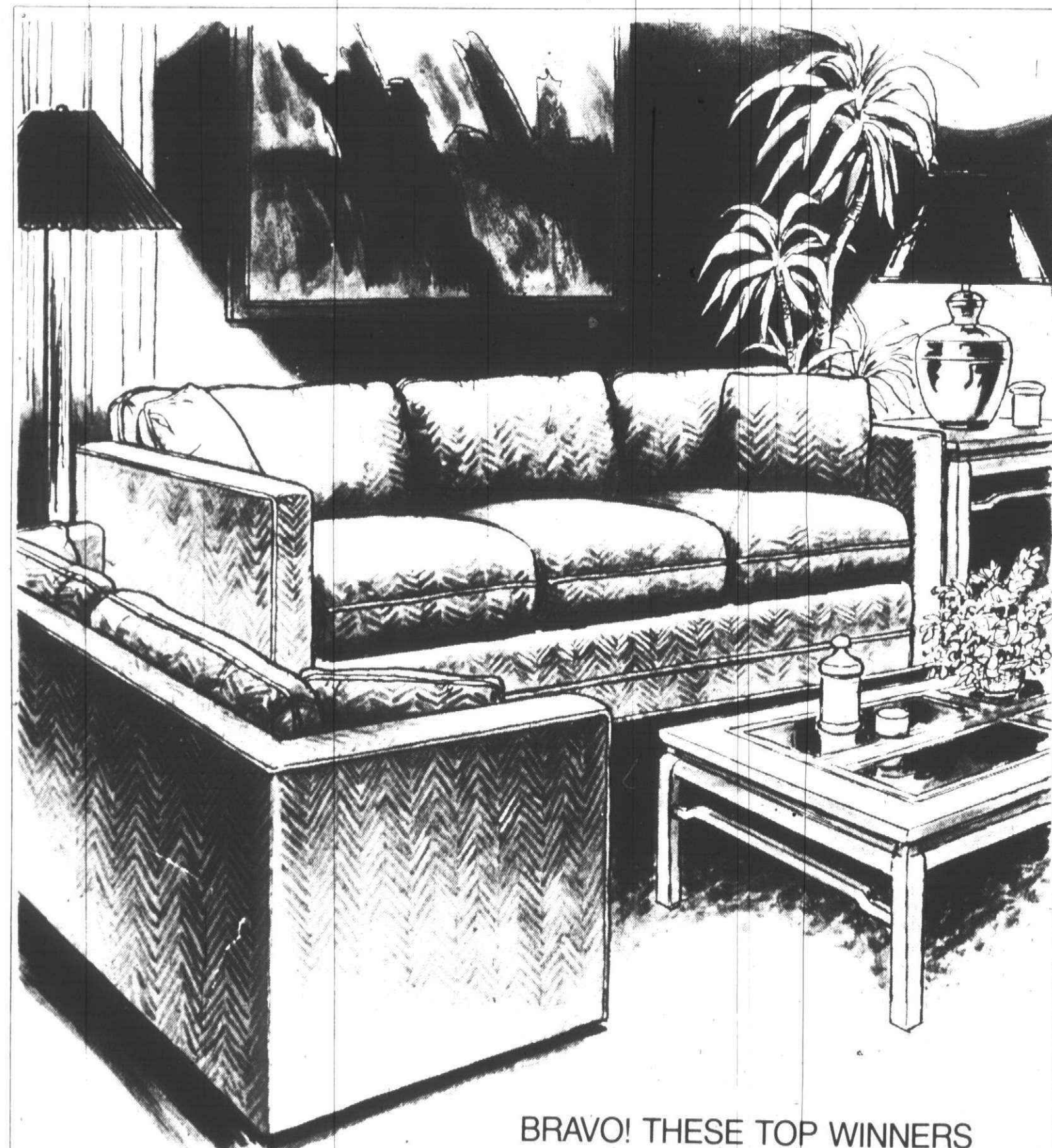
The third stage will consist of a simulated lunar colony (vacation-oriented) resort area. This will include a hotel themed as if it were located on the moon's surface, to be built on about acres adjacent to I-94 and west of Whittaker Road.

The first stage of developing 90 acres is to be ready for use by May 1980, the second stage of 58 acres will be developed over a 5-9 year period. The third stage will overlap the second, but a completion target hasn't been fixed yet.

From now through the winter of 1980, an average minimum of 700 construction industry personnel will be employed on the site with peak construction employment figures likely to reach the thousands.

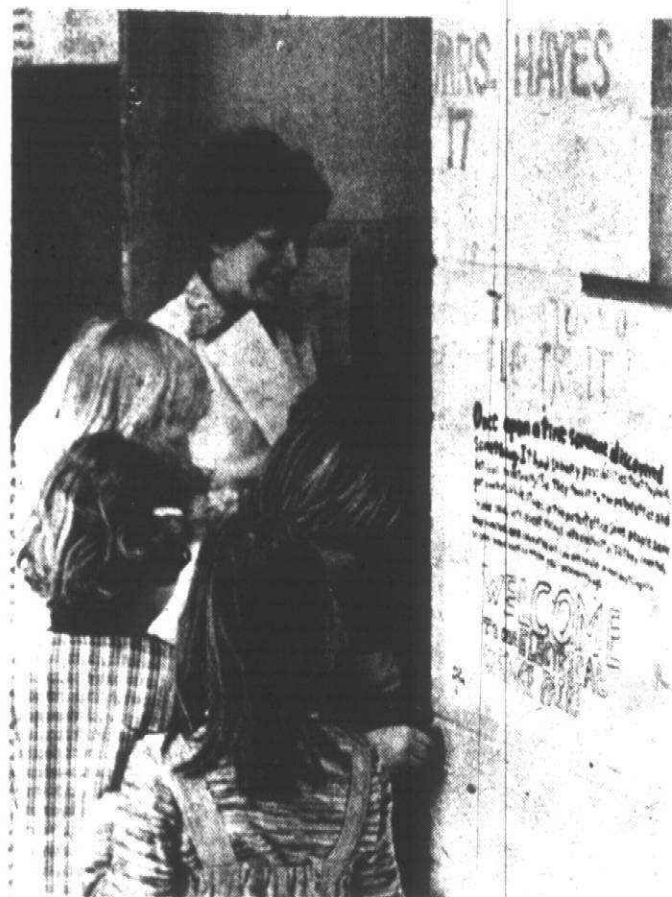

Bird Elementary pupils get a buzz from electricity.

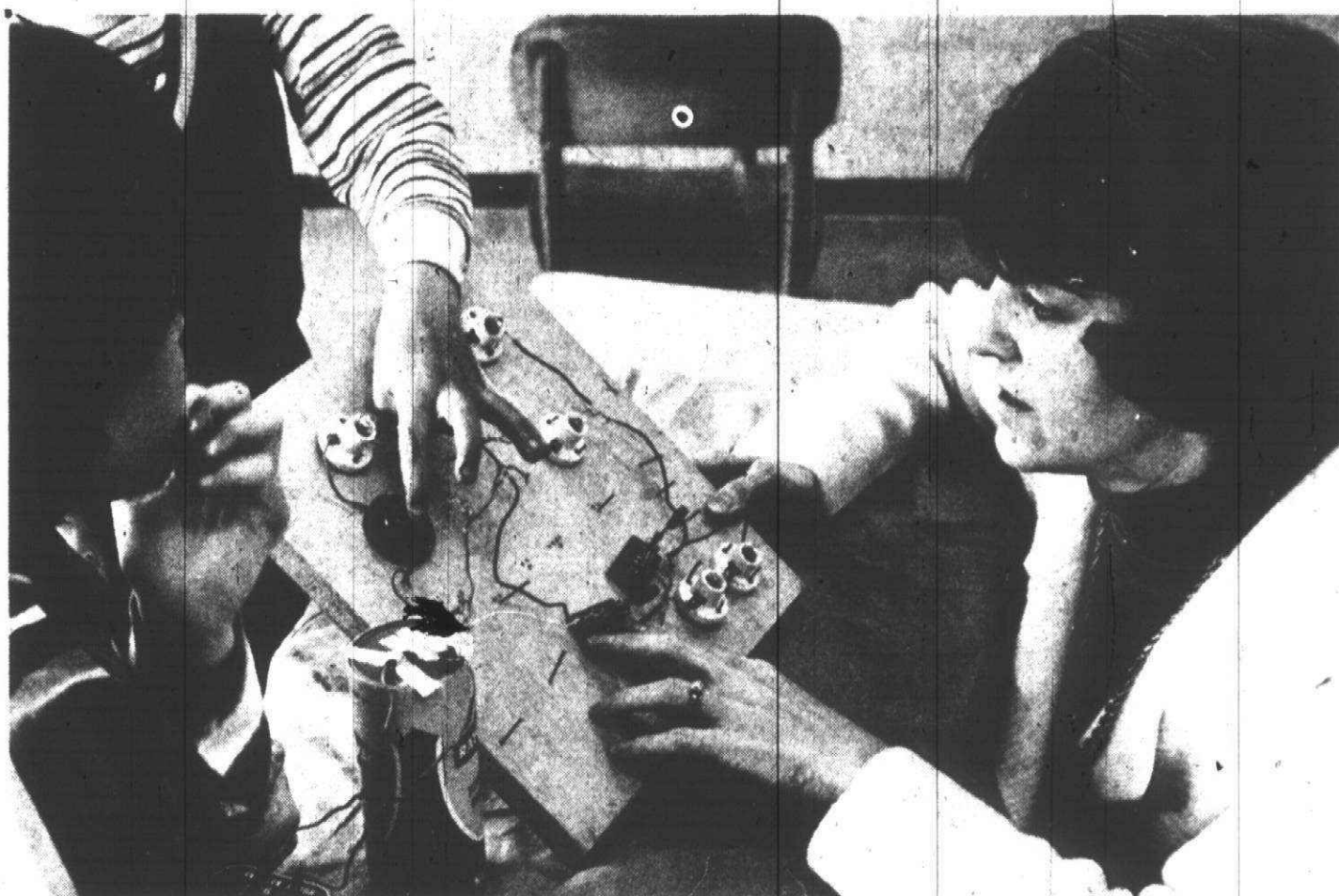
That's because they've learned about electricity by doing, rather than listening to science lectures or watching instructors demonstrate how circuits work.

Teacher threatens suit over dismissal

A schoolteacher who has been asked to resign and a parent who is upset over the placement of his daughter into Plymouth Canton High School have each threatened the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education with lawsuits.

James Durkin, a special education teacher at Plymouth Salem High School for the past eight months, said he will seek legal assistance if the school board votes not to renew his contract next week.

Durkin has completed his probationary period but may not be hired on permanently. School administrators have recommended that he not be granted tenure. Durkin was one of three teachers given the opportunity to resign. He is the only one to dispute the grounds for his recommended dismissal.

The charges concerning Durkin's teaching abilities were not made public. Norm Kee, school personnel director, would only say that "certain irregularities" existed early in Durkin's teaching stint here that put him on

unstable ground.

Charles Griffin, executive director of the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA), told school board members Monday night that all of the evaluations done on Durkin are invalid. They either were completed after the appropriate deadlines or done by an administrative intern—both violations of negotiated items, according to Griffin.

GRiffin ASKED the board to postpone its decision until Monday. The trustees voted to hold a special meet-

ing on Monday to determine Durkin's fate.

"We feel this action should not take place," Griffin told the board. "This teacher is very valuable to the community. A grave injustice would be done here tonight if the board decided not to renew his contract."

"He has received many commendations and there are parents here to speak in his behalf. You would be destroying a promising career by acting tonight."

Kee told Griffin he was surprised the PCEA would solicit support from parents for Durkin because the schools could easily "get statements the other way, too."

"This is a very serious problem," said trustee Flossie Tonda. "These are special kids who need special teachers. We don't have the luxury of waiting. We have to think of the kids more than the employees."

"I am concerned with the substance of the evaluation as well as with the technicalities brought up by Griffin. I am interested in the man's career but our obligation is to the students. I'm willing to run the risk for our kids," said Trustee Richard Arlen.

GEORGE LOVICH, incensed by the school board's refusal to accept his random selection appeal, said he will exercise his only available option and take the schools to court.

Random selection is the process by which the schools place junior high students into one of the district's two high schools. It is used to keep enrollments balanced at both schools.

Parents who were unhappy with their children's assignments were given the opportunity to appeal before March 13. It was not until that date, however, when the board indicated it would accept appeals based on friendship reasons only.

Prior to March 13, the board said it would approve appeals only for special education and emotional reasons, according to Lovich.

"I had no reason to make an appeal until March 13, the date when the board changed its position and most of my daughter's friends were able to switch schools," Lovich said. "When my daughter first got the letter saying she was to attend Canton High School, we told her she could not appeal because it was the luck of the draw."

"I told her she had no special reason other than friendship, which the board said did not count. We told my daughter she has to play by the rules and then the board goes and changes them."

MRS. TONDA TOLD Lovich that the board waited until March 13 to decide on the criteria of the appeals to prevent "everyone from writing a letter to appeal."

'CIA' wants sewers stopped

A Plymouth Township homeowner's group is planning to put up some stiff opposition to extending new sewer lines into the western section of the township.

Members of the Community Improvement Association (CIA) have been circulating petitions which ask for a referendum on a \$2.8 million bond to finance five sewer extensions west of Sheldon Road.

The township board of trustees approved the projects last month and authorized the Wayne County Department of Public Works to sell the bonds.

The CIA has until the first week in

May to gather signatures of 10 per cent of the township's registered voters to stop all action on the projects and put the bond issue on the ballot.

Although the petitions have been circulating for just a little more than a week, Greg Dean, CIA president, said he has no doubt enough people will sign to force the township to schedule an election.

The five projects Dean's group opposes are:

- The Plymouth Hills laterals.
- The Sly drain trunk extension.
- The Byron Creek trunk extension.
- The Powell Road extension.
- The Tonquish Creek extension.

If the sewers are completed, the

entire western portion of the township will be opened up for new development.

A "fact sheet" put out by the CIA argues that while the Plymouth Hills and Sly drain extensions will serve current residents, the other three "will primarily serve to facilitate new development."

Dean said his group is opposed to the board approving the projects without consulting the voters and is also opposed to the growth that would follow the sewers.

"We have never been in favor of uncontrolled growth," he stated. "Particularly after seeing what has happened in Canton Township."

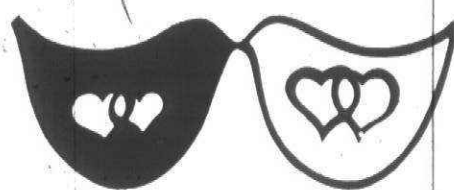
Feel free to interpret it. Myself? I don't worry about them.

Cops, court get office space

Police will move into township hall once Canton office workers pack their belongings and move into the township's new administration building in July.

Township board members Tuesday authorized Ralls-Hamill Architects, Inc. to draw up plans that will convert old township hall into a police station.

The architects will also draw plans for conversion of the township's meeting hall in the fire station at Canton Center and Cherry Hill into a 35th District courtroom.

Township Finance Director Mike Gorman expects that by fall District Judge Dunbar Davis will hold court in Canton as well as in courtrooms in Plymouth and Northville.

Canton board members will hold their meetings in the new administration building.

GORMAN ESTIMATES the cost of the renovations at \$215,000.

The cost breaks down as \$136,000 to convert township hall into a police station, \$44,000 to convert the front of the

Canton Center firehall into a courtroom and \$35,000 for contingencies. The cost of a third project—construction of a public restroom in the fire station on Warren near Haggerty—is estimated at \$9,000.

A \$15,000 federal block grant will be used to offset part of the cost of converting the fire hall into a courtroom, Gorman said.

The finance director expects Canton police officers will remain headquartered in a trailer behind the present township hall until renovation of front offices is completed—probably next fall.

Plans have not been made for the trailer that is now shared by the police and building departments. Building employees will move into the new administration building along with township office workers.

TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE Robert Myers voted against both the courtroom and police renovation projects, while Trustee Brian Schwall voted against authorizing architectural plans

for the conversion of township hall into a police station.

"I think they should put the police station and courtroom into the \$3 million white elephant on Canton Center Road," said Myers, referring to the new administration building. The trustee voted against constructing the building even though the township received a \$2.7 million federal grant for the project.

Although Trustee Lynne Goldsmith voted for all three renovation projects, she expressed fear that the police department will outgrow its new offices.

"If we do have to build new quarters for the police department in seven to 10 years, that doesn't mean we have to throw this building out," Trustee Eugene Daley said of the present township hall. "It could even be used as a branch of the police department."

Police Chief Walter MacGregor said the present township hall should be able to house his growing police department for "five, seven or maybe even 10 years."

because revenge clouds their perception.

"Generally we won't work with them," Laatz said. "You have to be very careful because emotions are involved. They may not be entirely truthful. They just want to get back at the guy because he doesn't like the way he's treating his sister or maybe he owes him money. We can't have that."

THE DRUGS narcotics officers are working hardest to intercept, Laatz said, are Asian heroin, South American cocaine and bathtub Phencyclidine (PCP).

In the suburbs, cocaine and PCP use

is staggering, said Laatz, overshadowed only by marijuana.

Because the department has a limited budget to spend on drug buys, Laatz said they must use their money wisely. "You could spend \$20,000 on one deal," he said.

For that reason the department usually steers away from busting persons selling a pound or two of marijuana.

"It's a question of priority," Laatz said.

"Unless we're talking 50 to 100 pounds of marijuana, I don't have the time or manpower to do it. We're not going to spend a lot of money on it and tie that money up in a court case when there's people selling quantities of heroin or cocaine at the same time."

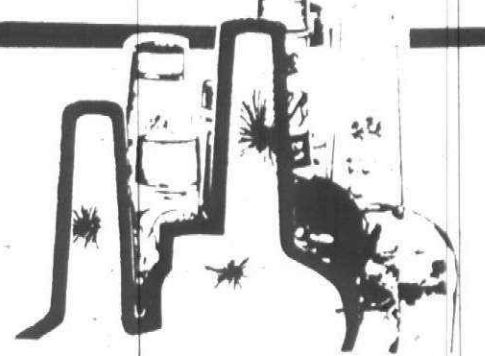

CEP to host state band festival

As in 1974, the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park will again be one of 12 sites in the state to host the Michigan High School Band and Orchestra Association State Band Festival.

The festival will take place Saturday at the CEP beginning at 8 a.m. with the first performing band and run until about 5 p.m.

In an MSBOA festival, participating bands are scored by three judges in a concert performance and by one in sight-reading. Each band is to play a march, a required piece, and a selected number for its concert performance and a march and a concert

piece that the band has never seen before in sight-reading.

Plymouth judges will be Thad Hegerberg, from Michigan State University, Ken Bauman for Spring Arbor College, Harold Luoma from Muskegon Community College and Dwight Smith from Elk Rapids.

Participating in the Class AAA division will be the Plymouth CEP Symphony Band, Detroit Cass Technical High School and Livonia Bentley High School Band.

The Bad Axe High School Band, Sandusky High School Band and the Plymouth Canton Concert Band will be

entered in Class C. L'Anse Creuse North High School Band, Northwest High School, Lake Orion, Clio, Northville, Lapeer, Chippewa Valley from Mount Clemens, East Detroit and the Plymouth-Salem Concert Band will all be playing in the Class A division.

The CEP Symphony Band, under the direction of James R. Griffith, will be playing in the Salem auditorium at 8 a.m. The Canton Concert Band, also under the baton of Griffith, is slated for 10:45 a.m. and the Salem Concert Band, under the direction of Marc Dickey, will be performing at 4:40 p.m.

After the concert performance, bands will move into the Salem band room for sight-reading in which each band is allowed seven minutes to look over two pieces of music. The seven minutes may be used to look through the music for key and tempo changes and players may also finger through their parts but are not allowed to play on their instruments.

Final ratings are determined by averaging out the four judges scores. Ratings range from first to fifth. To become eligible for the state festival, all bands must have had a first division rating at the district festival.

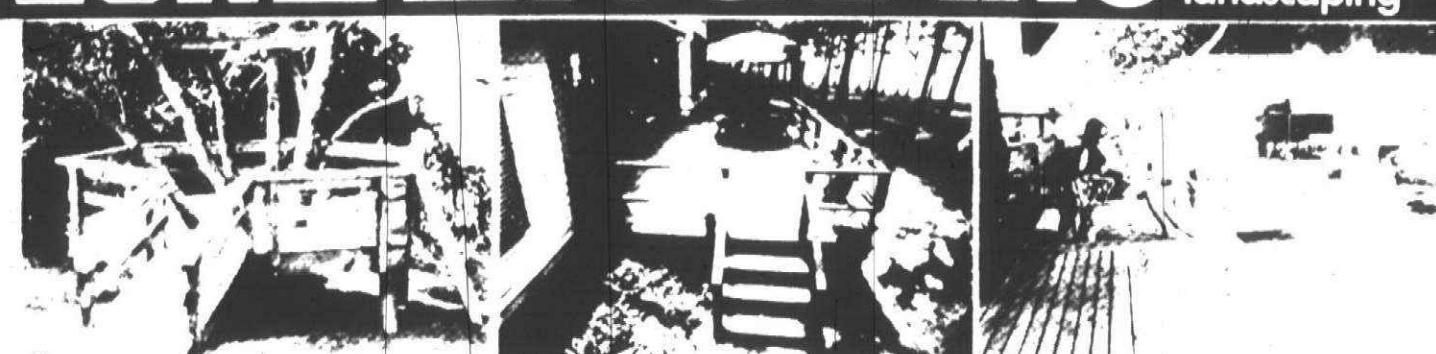

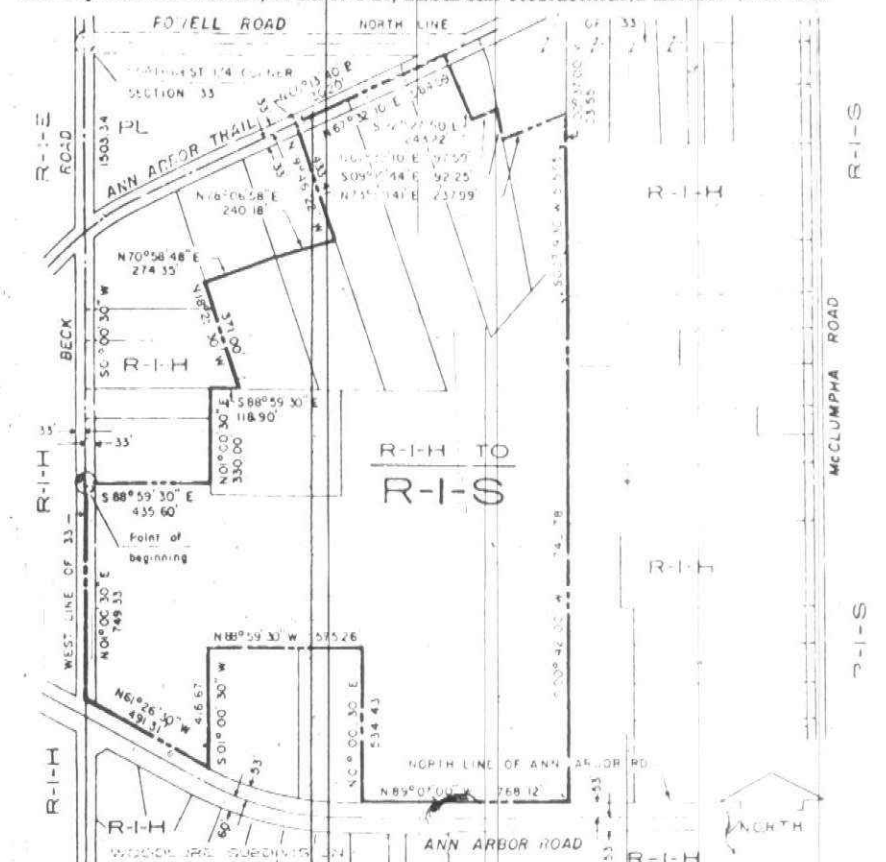

Selle marks 25th year selling cars

Twenty-five years have passed since Jack Selle, the local Buick dealer, sold his first automobile, but the memory of it is just as fresh as though the sale was made yesterday.

Sitting in his office on Ann Arbor Road, peering at a beautiful trophy presented him from the Buick division of General Motors to mark the silver anniversary of his dealership, Selle smiled and said it didn't seem that long ago when he got started.

"I had purchased the dealership from Carl Shear when it was on Starkweather Street and my first real sale was to George Schuder, who then was the general manager of Evans Products.

"We only had four cars in stock so I had to take orders, and my first order came from John Duke, the barber, and the next from Colburn Dennis who lived on Canton Center Road.

"It is all so plain now and it is difficult to believe that so much time has gone by."

A LOT OF gasoline has been burned in Buicks since those days and Selle relived many of the big moments as he allowed the memories to come tumbling back.

"Would you believe it, I started with three salesmen and I still have one of them. He is Clarence Wolf and he has shared the pleasure and the turmoil through the years."

Wolf now is only one of 30 men working at the dealership that has grown to

be one of the best in Wayne County. And through the years, due to the success of the venture, Selle has held almost every office in the various dealership organizations.

One of the memories which came rushing back in a hurry was of the fire which destroyed the showroom and offices on April 14, 1972.

"It started just as we were about to close business for the day and, in fact, I was just about to start for home when the blaze was discovered. It was a feeling I will never forget—just imagine your business going up in flames and smoke.

"Fortunately, enough of it was salvaged to give us a new start and here we are celebrating a silver anniversary."

SELLE HAS SEEN many changes since the days he gave up his auto collision business to become a Buick dealer on April 1, 1953.

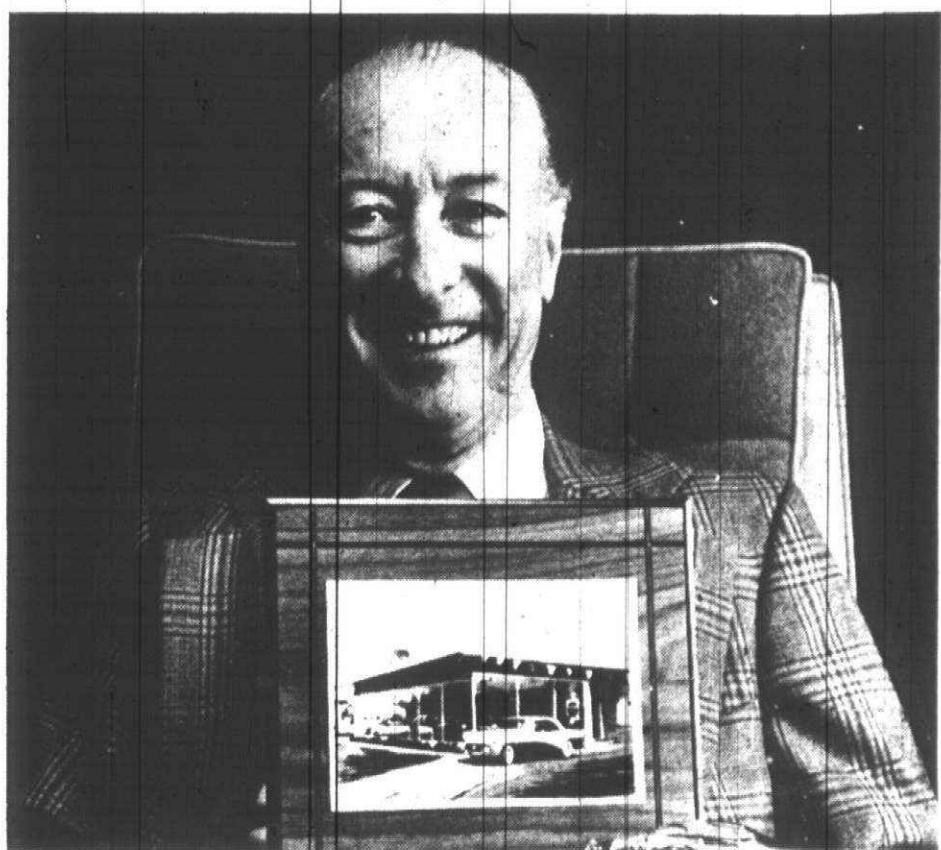
"Buick had only four models in those days. They were the Special, the Century, the Super, and the Roadmaster. We still have the Century model today. Instead of four models, though, we have seven and each of them has variations, so you have many models from which to choose."

Still disturbed by the high prices, Selle is quick to admit today's automobile is a better car than it was when he went into business.

"It's a better engineered job, and has more refinements for the pleasure of the owner. But that doesn't account for all of the jump in prices.

"The government regulations have been the cause of much of the rise in prices and even now there is no telling what will be demanded next."

One thing is sure. The day of the big car in most lines is about ended. Yet Selle is surprised that many of his longtime customers still want the big car.

"He was very helpful," Juhasz said. "We worked out the space needs, and

he told me what was available."

Juhasz handled all the other arranging. He booked the entertainment, food, beverage, lighting and props.

"Since this is the first time, I'm taking a flyer. But if it goes, I could see it in a more permanent location. That's down the road, though."

The Disco Inferno, as it has been named by Dana, will open at 6 p.m. tomorrow and go until 11. Tickets cost \$3 apiece.

"I don't want anybody to think a non-profit group, because it isn't," Juhasz said. "I want to make some profit."

Volunteer ham radio operators organize tornado alert team

Wayne County officials are well prepared to warn the public to take cover from potentially dangerous spring weather—including tornadoes, severe thunderstorms and flash floods.

The assurance came from Vice-chairman Richard E. Manning (D-Redford) and fellow western Wayne County Commissioners R. William Joyner (D-Plymouth), Thomas Presnell (D-Westland) and Mary E. Dumas (R-Livonia). They recently checked with the Wayne County Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP) regarding plans to protect the public from threatening weather.

The commissioners said OEP and a trained volunteer staff of ham radio operators have a well-developed communications plan to cover its 51 station Skywarn tornado watch network.

WITHIN 30 SECONDS of a funnel sighting, the Skywarn program is capable of broadcasting a warning throughout six counties in southeastern Michigan, they said.

"When severe weather conditions are indicated, a group of specially-trained volunteers rush to their spotter stations to begin the watch for potential funnel clouds which strike most often in the April to July period," Manning said.

The operators are equipped with radios that provide immediate two-way voice contact with their base station located at the Wayne County Emergency Operating Center in Westland.

Area residents are among the 135-member volunteer staff available to man carefully selected lookout points throughout Wayne County's 622 square miles, Mrs. Dumas said.

Generally, the lookout points are located in shopping center parking lots and along open roads so that the radio hams can monitor the weather from their cars and report conditions on their mobile radios.

"The Wayne County volunteers are particularly important in helping avert tornado disasters because tornadoes can't be detected by radar until they have hit the ground and picked up a lot of debris," Presnell said.

"THE SKYWARN network provides an early warning system that can save lives," said Joyner. "With the mobile stations linked to the Wayne County sheriff's radio transmitter, a spotter's warning can be broadcast immediately over an inter-county police radio network covering Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Monroe, Washtenaw and St. Clair counties."

A tornado warning is declared once a funnel cloud has been sighted.

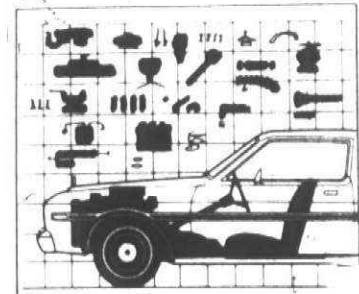

Maybe it is just plain Pennsylvania Dutch stubbornness. Maybe it is the fact that his paternal grandparents were skeptical County Derry Irish. And it could be that it is the small trace of Indian blood in him. But, for one reason or another, The Stroller has never believed in miracles.

Oh, sure, in his childhood he was taught the Bible stories of how 5,000 persons were fed on a few fish and a loaf of bread. And he well remembers the dividing of the Red Sea and all the drama connected with it.

THROUGH THE YEARS, though, they seemed to be just a few stories and were taken for granted. The Stroller never seriously thought of them as miracles.

He remembers, too, as he was growing up, he heard folks back home saying, "if she lives it will be a miracle." In all cases she died. Or what they thought could be a miracle never happened.

Then into The Stroller's life came a great change of heart. And now he has every reason to believe in miracles.

It all started about six months ago when Leona, his helpmate for nigh unto a half century, declared that she no longer could stand the pains of arthritis in her knee. Bouyed by what she had read of the latest medical sciences, she declared that she was going to undergo surgery for the placement of a new knee.

Once the decision (and it had to be her's) was made, we got in touch with a surgeon who had worked on her before. She had faith in him. When he told her it was a case of going through life in pain or getting a new knee, she didn't hesitate.

"I'll take the new knee," she said.

No sooner said than done—she entered the hospital with an air of confidence seldom seen in a new patient. It was to be a two-week affair. And it was promised that she would be home for Christmas.

Then, like a little soldier, she went under the knife and was all smiles as she showed visitors her bandaged leg and told one and all that it wouldn't be long before she was back in stride. The surgeon added to her hopes when he said she'd be dancing by the end of summer.

ALL WAS GOING well until a few days before she was to come home for Christmas.

Then came a turn that cast a bit of a doubt on her scheduled recovery. It was the Thursday evening before Christmas when she was struck with a severe case of bronchitis. She began fighting for breath. One by one, the attendants came to her bedside with the latest type of equipment and checked every breath. With long tubes in her nose and her eyes faded, she fought.

Then, of a sudden, on this Thursday, two doctors and three nurses entered the room. What could have happened?

"There's something in her body fighting medication," the doctor said, "and I fear it might be blood clots on her lungs. But we plan to stay on the job till we find them."

The next day his theory of the blood clots proved true and along with them came a severe case of fungus that covered both upper and lower lips. Her appearance was anything but that of a patient on the way to recovery.

But like the soldier she is, she fought back. For five long weeks she fought. Finally came the day she was discharged.

"It will be about three months," the surgeon told her, "one month of crutches, one month with a walker, then a month with a cane."

AS A STARTER she shunned the crutches. She got by with a walker and learned to handle it real well.

Several weeks ago, the walker was put aside in favor of a cane. She was able to get around the house. In the kitchen, she learned to cook with one

hand on the can. She even went shopping, supporting herself on the market basket. Her eyes were getting their old color back. Her cheeks were filling out. She began walking at a brisker pace.

Then came Sunday. With the spring sun shining down on her, she decided to take the ultimate test—driving her little yellow Buick.

With all the confidence she had

shown on entering the hospital more than four months ago, she managed to get into the driver's seat not knowing what might happen.

Backing out of the curved driveway, she smiled. Out onto the street and then around a cul-de-sac, she headed for the highway.

"I'm okay," she said, and continued around the block (one-half mile each way).

With a broad smile she drove back to the familiar driveway, drove the car into the garage, just like old times. ANOTHER BRIDGE crossed on the road to recovery.

To The Stroller it was a miracle—from the sight of her fight for breath with blood clots on her lung, to the smiling lady who conquered another obstacle in her path.

If that isn't a miracle, what is?

No skill is more sedentary than writing. A weekend of fitness relaxed and invigorated by body simultaneously, while freshening my mind. Now I have come a full circle to sit down and write and tell you that "Fitness is Fun!"

Soil district will elect 3 directors

The Wayne County Soil Conservation District will hold its eighth annual meeting, Tuesday, May 4 beginning at 7:30 p.m. in room 250 of the Wayne County Intermediate School District's building, 33500 Van Born, Wayne.

The purpose of the meeting will be the election of three district directors. The three-year terms of Wilford Bunyea of Plymouth Township and Frank Bennett will expire this year. Another district director will be elected to fill the vacancy caused by David Raker's resignation. Raker's replacement will serve the remaining two years of the uncompleted term.

To be eligible to vote, Bunyea said, a person or firm must hold the title to has possession of at least three acres of land in Wayne County.

The newly published soil survey of Wayne County will also be discussed. The survey, Bunyea said, contains detailed maps of 363 square miles of county land.

There are 41 different soil types, he added. They have been analyzed for a wide range of factors, he said.

Michigan State University Prof. Lynn Roberson will also discuss "Soil and Man," giving special attention to the uses, limitations and functions of various soils.

Carl Silvers gets shafted

Former Police Commander Carl Silvers' request for a 90-day leave of absence from the Canton Police Department is a disturbing consequence of mismanaged administration.

The official reason for Silvers' leave is that he'd like time to fight his court case against the township. He's arguing in court that his job was eliminated for political reasons and maintains that he has a right to retain the commander job when the force goes full-time (if ever).

But the real reason Carl Silvers is leaving the department is that he was embarrassed by politicians who have exhibited an uncanny ability to alienate almost everyone in a command or patrol position in the Canton Police Department.

Silvers may be legally mistaken in his belief that he automatically holds the second-in-command position and does not need to undergo additional testing. But that is not the subject of this editorial.

It is not the policy of this newspaper to take an editorial stand that opposes high testing standards for all police officers. It is the policy of this paper to recognize an example of someone being squeezed out of a job through perfectly legal maneuvers.

To the Stein administration, Silvers was viewed as a Greenstein administration hold-over. He received little support from the Stein slate—namely, Supervisor Harold Stein, Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Eugene Daley.

THEY JERKED him around like a yo-yo after taking office. After removing former supervisor Robert Greenstein from the police chief post, they appointed Silvers as "interim police chief," an ominous title at best.

When something didn't go just the way Stein wanted it to go, Silvers was yanked out of that position and replaced by the township building superintendent who briefly held the title "director of police."

Finally, that madness ended when Police Chief Walter MacGregor was hired. MacGregor has shown a remarkable facility for tying together the frayed ends of the police department in this time of uncertainty. It could be argued that his appointment was one move supported by the Stein administration that turned out well. But the politicians shouldn't take too much credit for MacGregor's accomplishments.

The point is that Carl Silvers was slapped in the face by township administrators by being forced to hustle for a departmental job when the force decided to go full-time. They could have been more accommodating.

The regular officers were also given short shrift by the township board, at first, when they were told to re-apply and take their chances for full-time jobs like everyone else.

It's a humiliation to a man who raised a police department from the laughing stock of Michigan to a position of trust in the Canton and law enforcement communities.

Silvers taught his rookies to disregard any notion of playing Starsky and Hutch with .357 Magnums. The old-fashioned notion of a cop being a public service officer was drilled into the young rookies' heads.

Silvers' request for a 90-day leave, instead of a permanent one, shows he's still reluctant to completely cut himself off from the force. He was a Detroit cop for 25 years before coming to Canton. The man probably wears a badge on his pajamas.

In the interest of decency and fair play, township officials should ask Silvers to reconsider his all but inevitable resignation. One honorable deed won't kill them.

Boost for Laura

It could have happened to any of us. Born prematurely 23 years ago, Laura Pappas of Farmington Hills was placed in an incubator and over-exposed to oxygen. It cost her most of her sight. She can distinguish only light.

Nevertheless, Miss Pappas has been able to graduate from Western Michigan University in music therapy — she plays a half-dozen instruments — and moves about with the guidance of a Leader Dog named Flame, a Belgian Tervuren.

Laura and Flame are among 350 teams who graduate each year from the Leader Dog School in Rochester after a four-week course.

Running the school is an expensive proposition — it costs \$3,500 to train each team. The Leader Dog School's chief sources are 35,000 Lions Club members throughout Michigan.

The Leader Dog School is the most famous effort of the state's 500 Lions Clubs, but there are many other works. Among them are the Welcome Home in Grand Rapids, the Penrickton School in Taylor, eye examinations, glasses and Braille equipment.

The Lions Clubs, as we said, are a major force in underwriting this work, but they don't work alone. They are helped by the public — us. Each year we help by:

- Buying a white cane lapel pin from a Lions Club member.
- Obeying the law that requires motorists to

Impotent Wayne suburbs dealt out

As usual, the Wayne County suburbs are on the outside, looking in. The issue this time is public transportation.

In Oakland County, the board of commissioners and County Executive Daniel T. Murphy have organized a potent one-two punch in dealing with Gov. Milliken, Detroit Mayor Young and the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority. In case the maze of events confuses you, here's an outline:

- Early this month, Oakland County commissioners voted 18-8 to withdraw from SEMTA. They objected to 1) SEMTA's and the state's failure to provide funding for a county bus system and 2) Young's insistence on an extremely expensive and extensive subway system.

- County Executive Murphy held a high-level meeting April 14 with Milliken and Young. Murphy spoke as an equal, not as a small-town tinhorn. Everyone modified his position a little. Young made a statesmanlike statement: "Let the experts decide"—the experts being SEMTA.

- Murphy thereupon vetoed the board's withdrawal resolution. The "swing" votes upheld his veto.

- The Oakland board on April 20 passed another resolution declaring it would withdraw from SEMTA Oct. 1 unless it got its countywide bus system and SEMTA's plans were "void of a costly and extensive subsurface, elevated or other capital intensive transit system for one city."

THE RESOLUTION isn't really anti-subway. It speaks of an "extensive" subway, without defining "extensive."

Meanwhile, Murphy has room to maneuver in dealing with the governor, the Michigan Legislature, SEMTA and Mayor Young over who gets what public transportation improvements.

It used to go without argument that the mayor of Detroit was the public official below the governor who had the most clout.

Yet the truth is that in the tri-county metropolitan area, Detroit has less than one-third of the people (1.3 million of a total of more than 4.2 million).

The next most populous bloc is suburban Wayne County, with something like 1.2 million. The third most populous bloc is Oakland County, with about one million.

SO WHO WAS at that big meeting in the governor's Detroit office?

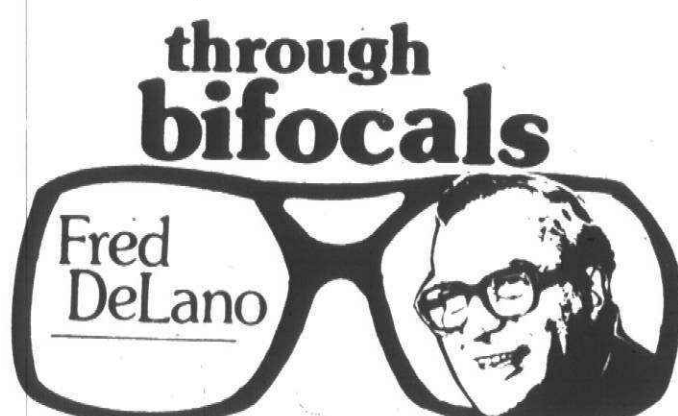
Milliken, Young, Murphy. No one from suburban Wayne County.

Oakland County has political clout for two reasons. One is the mere existence of a county executive who can defend his people's interests without being a bully about it. For all the bad-mouthing of the county executive system you hear, it's infinitely superior to having no one in charge, which is the case with Wayne County.

The second reason Oakland has clout is that people and politicians are able to unite and devise sophisticated political strategies to make themselves heard.

By the time of the next census, in 1980, outer Wayne County will almost certainly have more population than Detroit. It should enable the suburbs to elect a majority of Wayne County commissioners and to institute a county executive system. The executive can either be a suburbanite or someone who will listen to these suburbs.

Do we have the will to do it?



'Frills' raise us above mediocrity

If you are on Michigan's highways Saturday, you are going to notice far more than the usual complement of yellow school buses rolling along with traffic.

Inevitably, some motorist is going to wonder aloud where they're all going with their loads of students, or where they've been.

Just as inevitably, a second person is going to answer caustically in words such as these: "They've probably found a new way to waste taxpayers' money on one of those damn frills."

Such an individual is a confirmed No voter on millage election days. He wants the schools to teach only reading, 'ritin' and 'rithmetic. He doesn't believe that education goes an inch beyond the formal classroom.

Baloney.

THE NUMBER OF high school band and orchestra members on the highways Saturday may reach into the thousands.

In separate cars, hundreds of parents also will be making the trek to Traverse City, Grand Rapids, Kentwood, Grandville, Wyoming, Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti, Chelsea, Saline or Plymouth. These are the sites of state band and orchestra festival performances, the finalists qualifying by having placed at the highest level in district judging.

For instance, Bloomfield Hills will have an orchestra at Ann Arbor; where Clarenceville's concert band also will perform. The West Bloomfield symphony band is assigned to Ypsilanti, as are the Andover band, Adams High School's wind ensemble and Thurston's honors band.

The Adams symphony band and the Thurston concert band both go to Chelsea. Bentley's symphony band will be among 15 groups playing at



Plymouth, which will have three of its own units on stage.

Nothing could be healthier.

THROUGH THE YEARS I've noticed that those who would castrate a school budget start off by asking for elimination of the arts, music, sports and other extra-curricular activities.

They say, yes, it's all right to teach journalism, but cut out the school newspaper and the yearbook.

Have speech classes, but eliminate the debating team.

Include broadcasting courses, but don't go to the expense of having students operate a school-owned radio station such as the ones at Southfield and Plymouth.

Teach dramatics, but eliminate school plays and musicals. Deny such budding stage professionals as Plymouth's Linda Dwyer, Charley Burr and Dennis Cockrum their scholarships at Eastern Michigan University.

Do all these things with budget slashes and accomplish the big goal of bringing all students down to one common denominator: Mediocrity.

A WEEK AGO TODAY, The Detroit News published the names of 1,006 award winners from among the more than 6,000 entrants in its annual Scholastic Writing Contest.

I'm proud that 280 of these awards went to students attending 47 junior and senior high schools in O&E communities.

Power Junior High in Farmington led with 29. Then came Birmingham Seaholm High with 21.

William Lyon Phelps once said, "Being educated means to prefer the best, not only to the worst but to the second best."

Maybe the founder of the Interlochen Music Camp, Dr. Joseph E. Maddy, put it as succinctly as anyone when he spoke these words years ago:

"The purpose of education is obvious. It is to educate, not equalize."

May our boards of education and the opponents of so-called "frills" please pay heed.

Here's the 'facts' on township sewers

Editor: I read the article on the petition being circulated to bring the sewer expansion in the western portion of Plymouth Township to a vote (Observer, 4-20-78). Greg Dean (president of the Community Improvement Association) did not tell the whole story.

I feel the residents of the township should have all the facts before they make a decision on bonding the sewers.

In 1953, the Middle Rouge Interceptor Sewer was installed to provide Plymouth Township with a sewage outlet. All township property owners paid taxes to amortize the cost of the sewer.

In 1958, the township sold a sewer bond issue for \$790,000. In 1964 another sewer bond in the amount of \$850,000 was sold.

All township property owners are paying taxes to amortize the cost of those two bond issues. In 1977, the township levied 1.35 mills to pay for water and sewer bond issues.

The Middle Rouge Interceptor opened the township for development in the early 1950s. Lake Pointe was the first substantial development with existing sewer service.

The 1958 bond issue was used to provide sewer service to areas east of

Sheldon Road, such as Gold Arbor, Southworth, Arbor Village, Robinson sub, Rocker sub, Green Meadows, and Palmer Acres.

These areas were originally developed with septic tanks. The township used bond funds to install the lateral extensions in them.

Funds from this bond issue were also used for the Byron Creek trunk line extension out to Sheldon and Ann Arbor Road, which serves Woodbrook subs 1 and 2, Trailwood subs 1, 2 and 3, Quail Hollow and Beacon Trail.

THE 1964 BOND was used to extend the trunk line sewer out to Joy Road from Sheldon to Beck, which serves West Briar subs 1 and 2, Plymouth Meadows, Colony Farms 1 and 2, May-

flower Village, Parklane Meadows and Woodlore.

Woodlore was originally developed with septic tanks. The township recently used bond funds to install the laterals in this area.

The Tonquish Valley Sewer trunk line was extended from Sheldon Road out to North Territorial Road and serves Beacon Estates, Walnut Creek and Glenview subdivisions.

All areas that have developed in the township with sewer service are using the Rouge Valley or Middle Rouge Interceptor to discharge their sewage.

The policy in Plymouth Township of installing trunk line sewers—with all property owners sharing the cost—was established over 20 years ago.

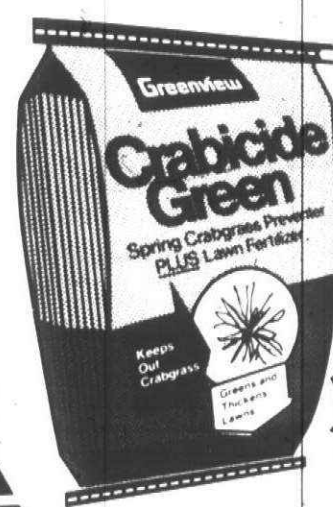

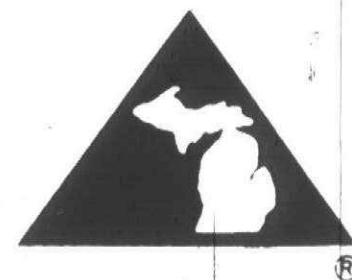

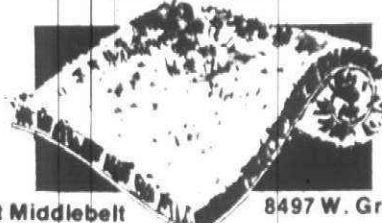

LARRY JAMES will be the announcer at Friday night's basketball game at Livonia Bentley High School.

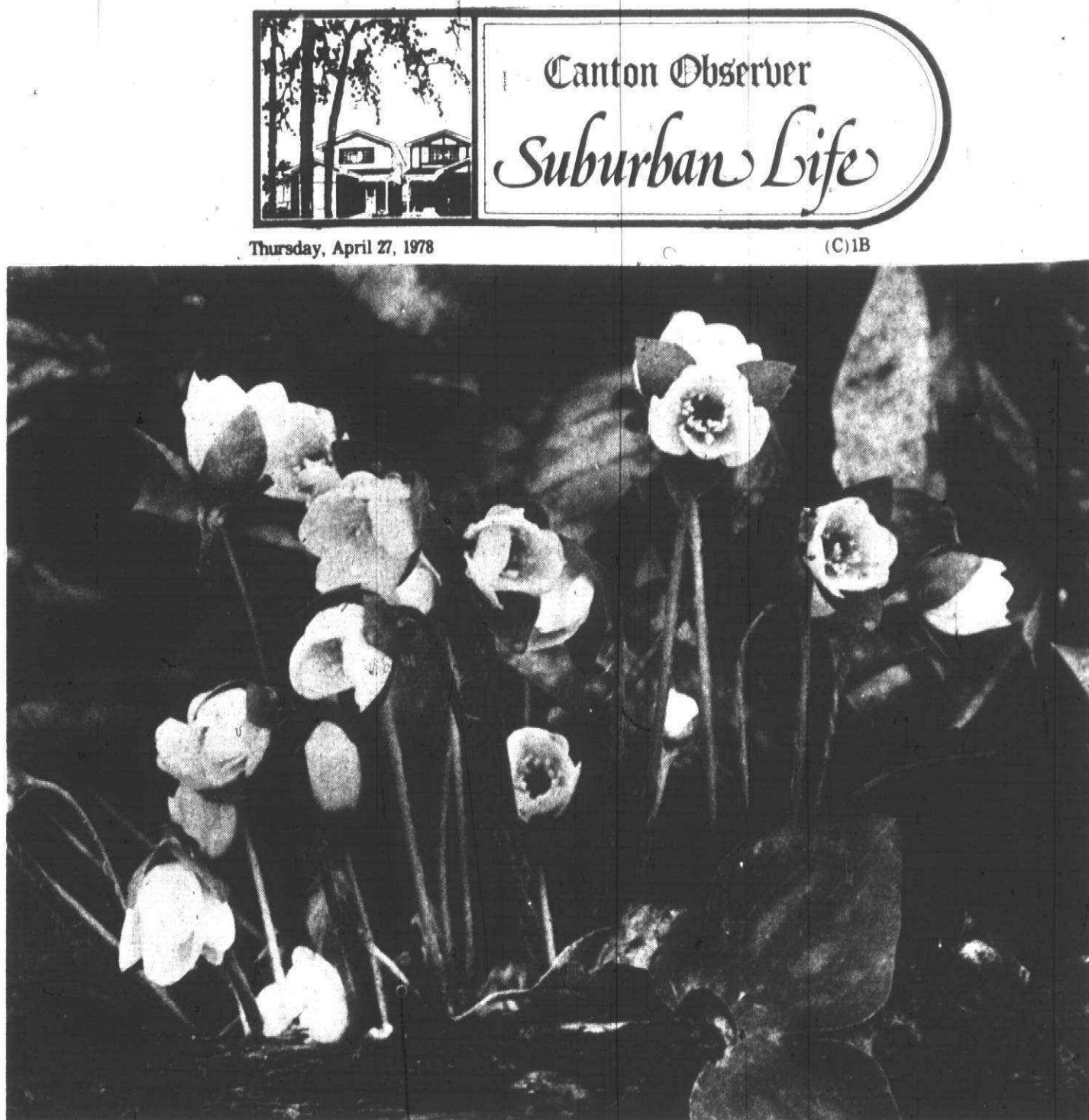

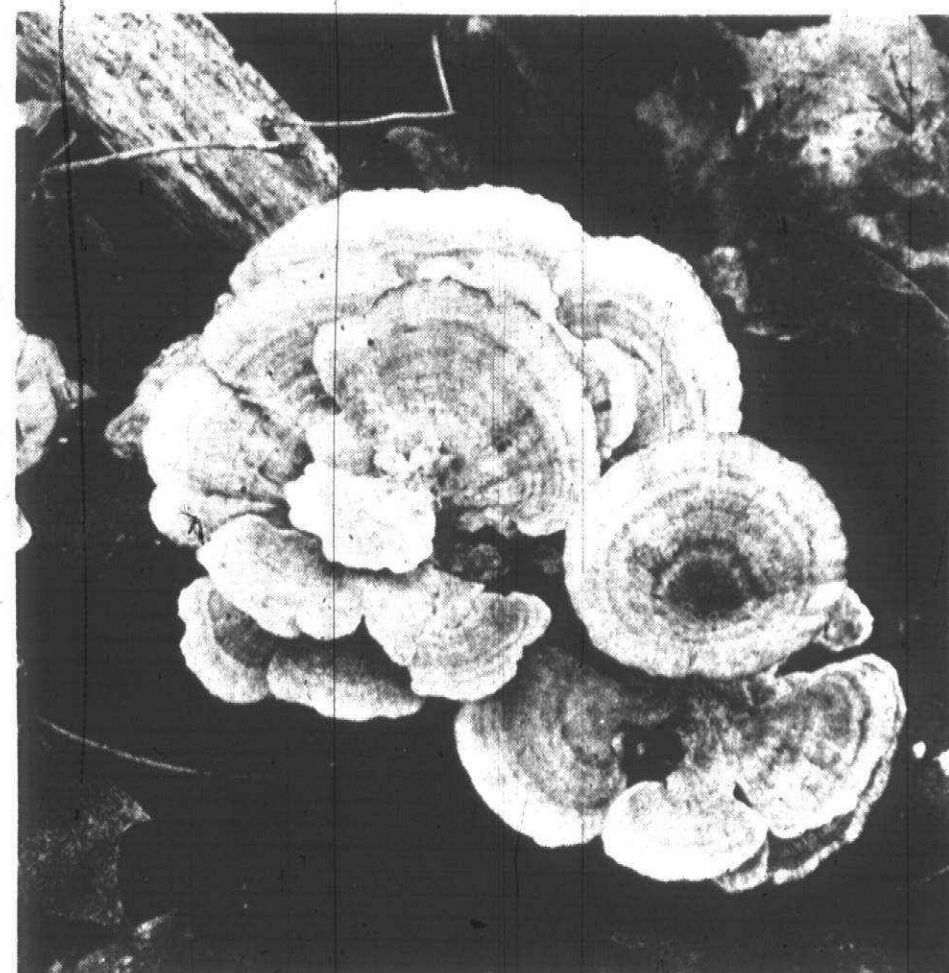
range from creamy whites, pastel pinks and lavenders, to deep blues and purples.

The club is sponsoring the show. Covers will be Washington at Valley Forge pictorial cancel on two different

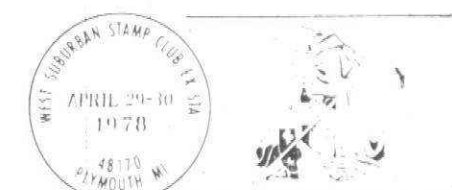
cachet covers commemorating the events of 1778—the signing of the alliance with France and Valley Forge.

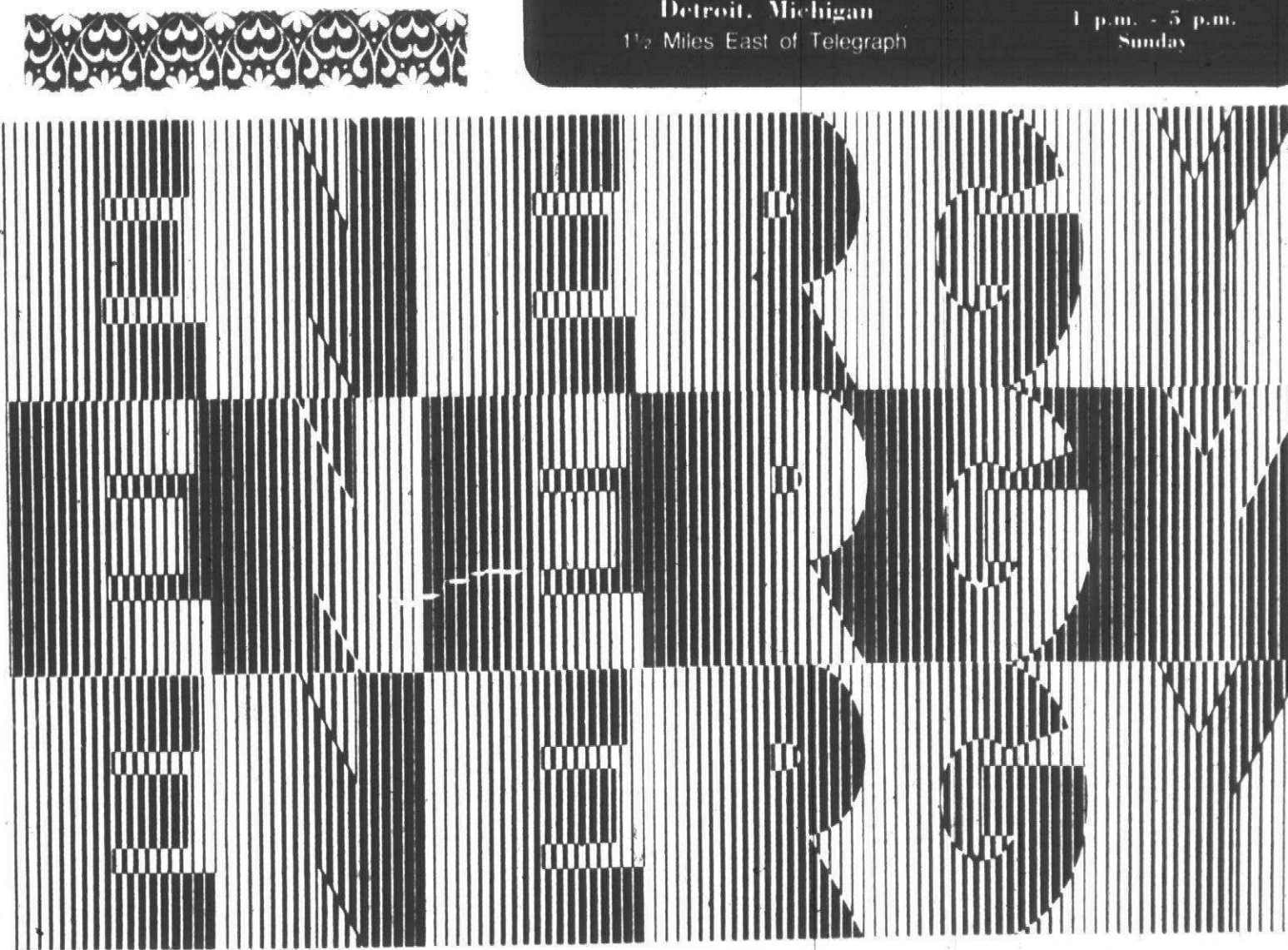

Jewelry, miniatures, furniture, Victorian silver, lamps, china and children's items are displayed throughout the house.

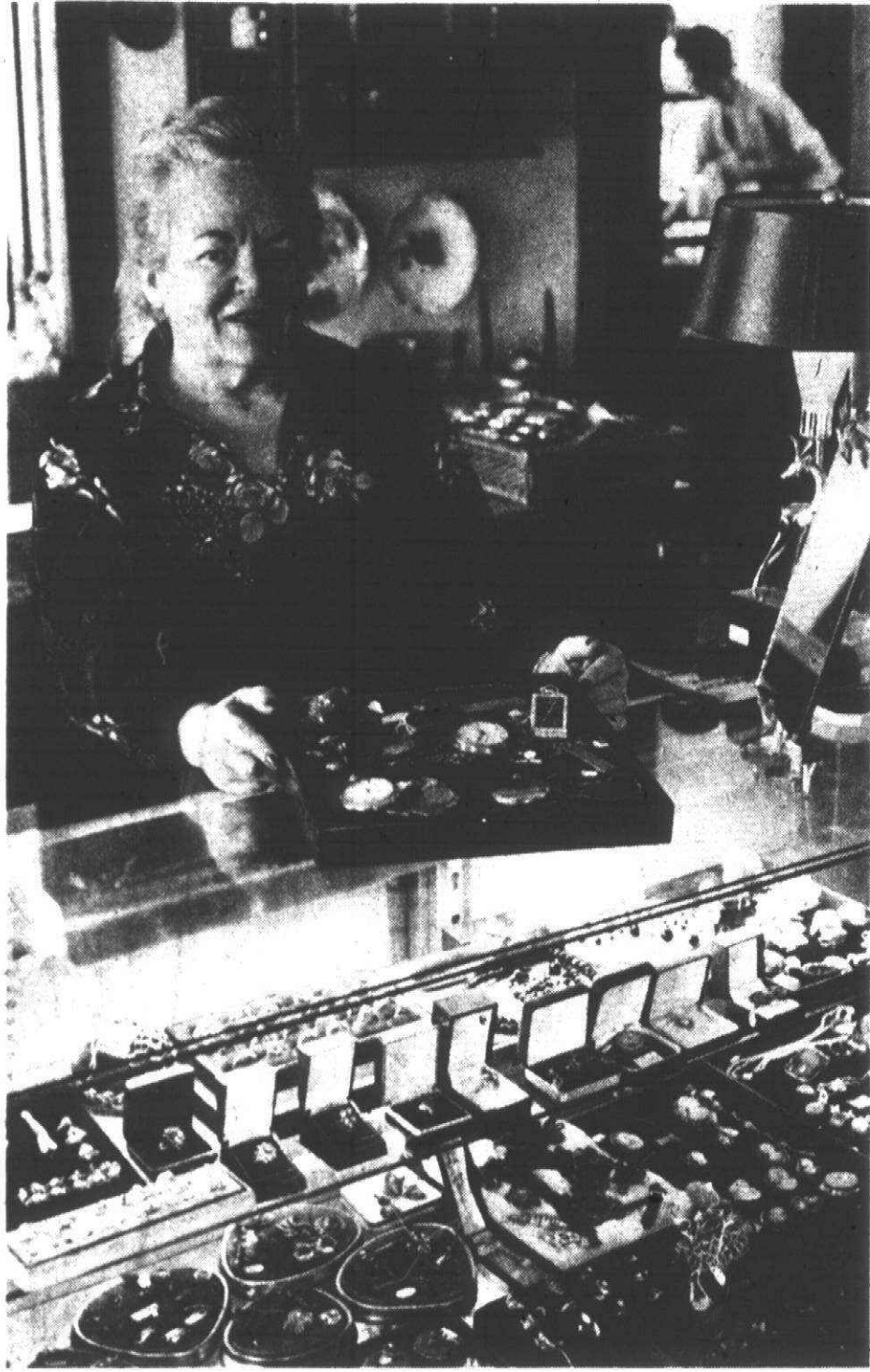
Each dealer has her own specialty but there is no this-is-my-booth look.

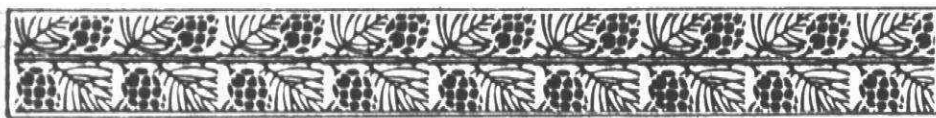

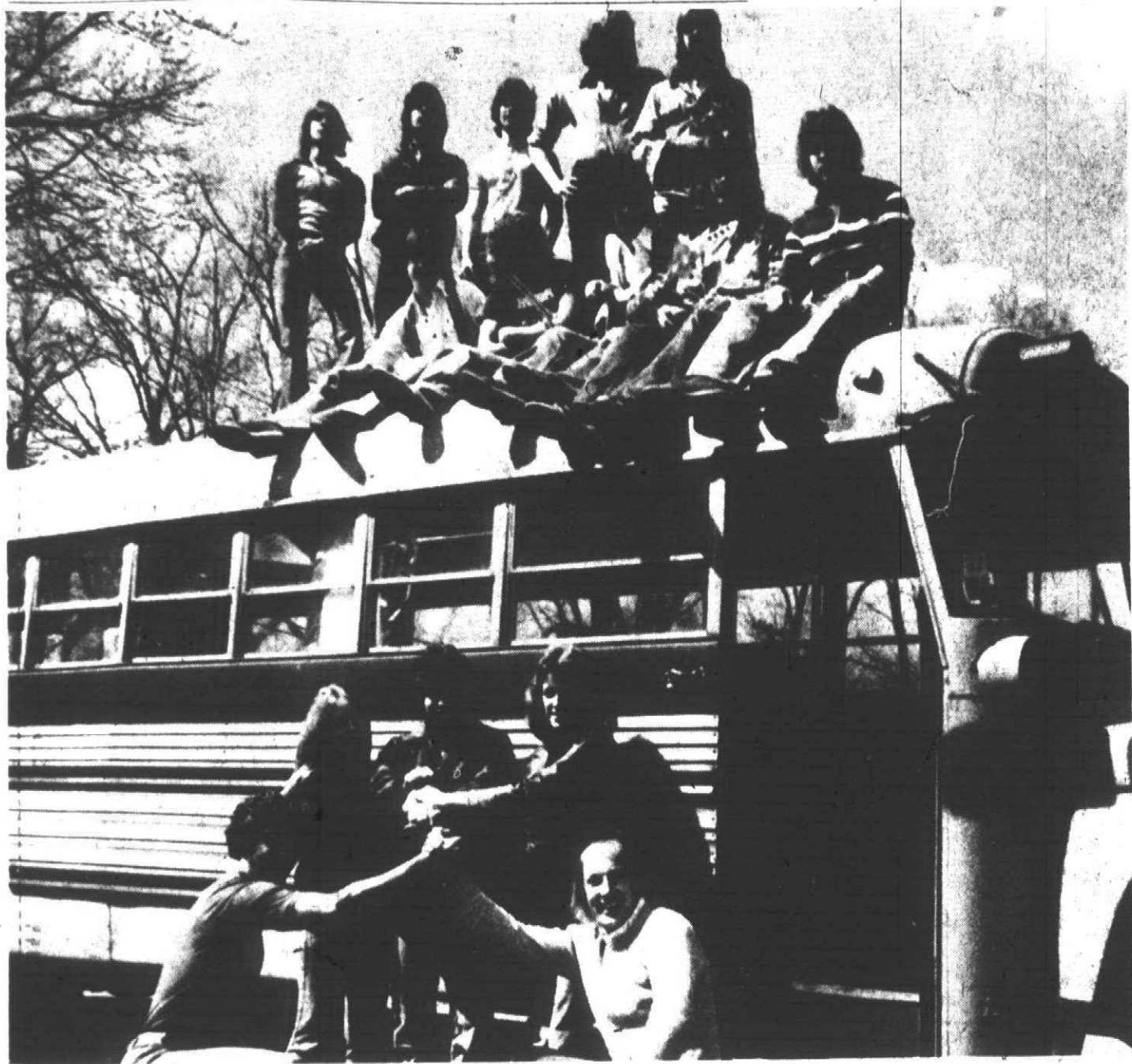

If coal had run out, many people might have been put out of work, as in some other states. And a lot of people would have been without electricity during rotating blackouts.


The deadline for filing applications is May 17. Winners will be selected by a committee of PCAC members and announced before the end of the traditional school year.

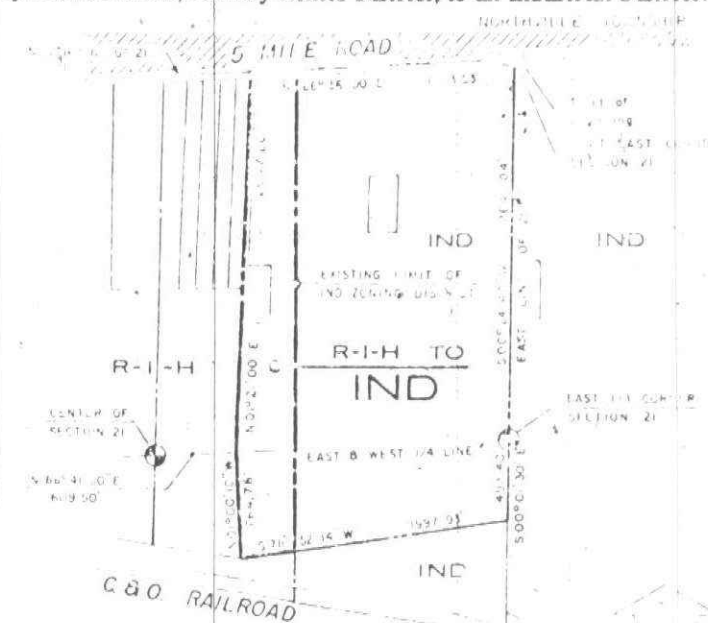

Theater groups join forces to produce a winning show

If you see just one community theater production this season, it should be "My Three Angels." And don't alibi out by saying you saw the Bogart movie on TV.

"Angels" is a joint production of the theater guilds of Livonia-Redford, Plymouth and Wayne-Westland. It runs in the intimate, 100-seat LRTG playhouse at 15138 Beech Daly (south of Five Mile) in Redford Township.

The executive director of the Livonia-Redford group, Pat Secor, said this production is frankly experimental.

"People in the shows go from one group to another. Because of mutual problems, we thought we should try to combine efforts. We decided to do one show together to see how it worked."

"After this show is over, our directors and boards will get together and see."

Their options: Merge all three groups; try one show jointly next season; try more than one show jointly; or forget the whole thing.

OF THE 10 persons in the cast, 8 1/2 of the performances must be rated as very good to excellent. The cast is drawn from all three guilds, as are producers and ushers.

Howard Egan, a veteran of commercial broadcasts as well as community theater, is Joseph, the super-salesman convict; Paul Cook, another veteran of the same endeavors, is

Jules, the accountant convict.

The story is based on a French play, and the theater version preserves the Gallic characterization and humor.

In the screenplay, the role of Joseph was rewritten around Humphrey Bogart.

The action takes place in the Ducotel family's living room in the rear of their general store in French Guiana. Felix Ducotel (David Tucker) is about to lose his store until his fortunes are reversed by three convicts from the penal colony — Joseph, Jules and the muscular Alfred (Gary Mekler).

Jules sums up everyone's lot: "People are crooked. The difference is that we (the convicts) got caught."

DIRECTOR Mark McCullough also plays the evil financier Henry Trochard and makes him such a convincing blackguard that one might forget how wonderfully subtle an actor McCullough is.

Outstanding as Mme. Ducotel is Mattie Wolf, who demonstrates the ethnic truism that Jewish mothers and bourgeois French mothers are made from the same mold.

The performance will be repeated April 28-29 and May 5, 7 and 7. Call the LRTG at 591-1951 for reservations.

Don't wait for the show to go on the road in other communities. Mrs. Secor said the idea was pondered but wouldn't work because "the sets are designed for our small stage. If we went elsewhere to a big high school, our sets would look bad on their stage."

LRTG, the veteran organization with 24 years experience, has the mature talent but is frank to admit it has been unable to recruit the enthusiastic youngsters that Plymouth and Wayne-Westland have.

From a playgoer's point of view, the trial marriage in "My Three Angels" is entirely satisfying. From a civic point of view, we all should hope the groups can pull it off again, one way or another.

Dearborn gallery hosts a show of glass

With a supporting cast of 67 artists, exhibiting hundreds of glass objects, the sixth annual National Glass Show has opened at the Habitat Gallery in Dearborn. It will be there until May 6.

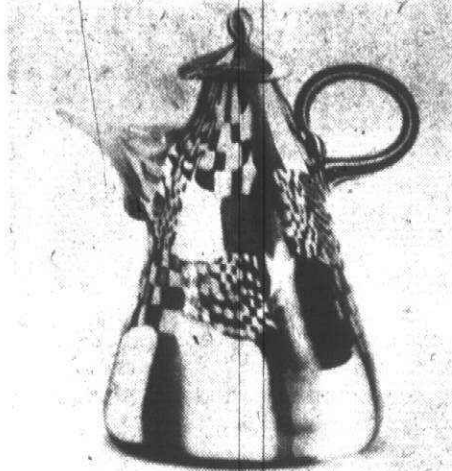
The Habitat Gallery is concerned with lots of things—prints, clay, fibers—but has been concentrating more and more on showing a variety of contemporary glass in this area.

The contemporary glass movement is a recent phenomena. Traditional glass tended to be functional, that was the primary concern, and artists, in the main, didn't have the encouragement, technical know-how, and the vision to push out of that safe role.

The consensus is that the contemporary glass movement, which began in 1962, was fathered by Harvey Littleton. Littleton came to glass naturally. His father was a vice-president of Corning Glass and the youngster's toys were all the trappings of glass manufacturing, including the glass rods. Although the natural artistic direction for Littleton to take would have been glass, he opted for clay, a more incompressible to a family connected so closely with the Corning.

LITTLETON WENT off to Europe as a potter, to travel and to learn. Gradually, he found his interest returning to glass with the stimulation of the glass and glass designers he saw there. So, he went back to glass. He came back to this country to explore these new ideas with fellow glass blowers, but it was a problem to get backing for the workshops, materials and furnaces necessary for the creation of the kind of glass in which he was interested.

The Toledo Art Museum picked up the challenge and supported seminars. Toledo is the home of Libbey-Owens Glass, and it was a logical starting point for contemporary glass. Between glass seminars at the museum in 1962 and 1963 led by Littleton, and the support of Lambino, one of the most impressive names in glass, who was at that time connected with Libbey-

Owens, the movement was off the ground.

The Habitat Gallery's first national glass show had 12 contributors. This one has 67. Many are repeats, but each year, the gallery has tried to both carry over the strongest artists of the previous year and introduce new ones.

In such a large show, there has to be some "also rans" but there is enough quality glass shown so that both the show and a visit to it are well worthwhile.

RICHARD MARQUIS from California takes simple shapes, a footed bowl or a teapot, and using the Marina process, that is, working with glass rods on molten glass, isolates brightly colored areas into almost glaze-like look.

Joel Myers shows clear globes that capture floating layers receding into infinity, as if reflections are caught in space.

Mark Peiser, a regular with the gallery, shows delicate flowers growing straight and strong out of the base. All is captured in a transparent shape.

Don Johnson, a local glass blower, shows loops of blue which snake across space.

John Lewis, who consistently shows beautiful glass, has three open, round, moody landscapes that have a tranquil Oriental mood.

Orient and Flume have etched a lovely mauve bowl of exquisite delicacy.

JAMES LUNDBERG'S paper weights seem to have captured the mystery of the unknown underworld, as if a Jacques Cousteau film has been halted in the middle of motion.

Paul Seide shows glass lamps that surround neon gas.

The contemporary glass movement, as are other crafts, is concerned with a particular material, but also expanding both the traditional form and traditional limits of that material.

The fine craft artist isn't bound by rules of the past, but is concerned primarily with creating an art which speaks for itself rather than echoing the past.

It's Schubert with glee at Marygrove

When Franz Schubert died 150 years ago at a young age, the world lost unknown musical treasures.

This year, the anniversary of that great Viennese master's death is being commemorated throughout the world, and two newly discovered sketches for the piano will be played in this area for the first time.

The occasion will be the annual concert of the Pro Mozart Society of Greater Detroit which will open at 7 p.m. Sunday at the Madame Cadillac Hall of Marygrove College in Detroit.

Marguerite Kozenn Chazot, founder of the society and its artistic director, and Lawrence LaGore, musical director, have also chosen compositions by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Antonin Dvorak.

Participating artists will include soprano Ernestine Nimmons; mezzo-soprano Rosemarie Murch; Fedora Horowitz, violinist; Pontaine Laing and Lawrence LaGore, pian-

ists; Emily M. Austin, violinist; James Tennan, cellist, and the Wayne State University Men's Glee Club under the direction of Harry M. Langsford.

Langsford, a native Detroit, has been conductor of the renowned Glee Club since 1945.

LANGSFORD said he didn't grow up in a musical family but that didn't stop him.

"The choral director at Mackenzie High School, 'Pop' Luscom influenced me the most and I decided as a teen to go into vocal conducting," he said.

Langford received a piano artist diploma the same night he graduated from Mackenzie from the Detroit Institute of Musical Arts, no longer in existence.

During his tenure as conductor, the Men's Glee Club has made five European tours.

"The first one was for the defense department and we toured to entertain members of the armed forces,"

he said. "The other four were on our own motivation."

Through the years, Langsford has

visited many European countries and has given concerts under many differing circumstances.

"Our glee club went to Washington, D.C., with the Detroit Symphony three years ago," he said. "We have a lot of students participating who aren't music majors but they love the camaraderie of the glee club."

He said the Mozart Society's concert is an annual affair, the purpose of which is to raise funds for the Mozartium in Salzburg, Austria. They teach music year-round and sponsor ambitious summer programs.

The Pro Mozart Society is the first organization of its kind in this country and was founded in 1960. Proceeds from this year's concert will be directed to the Mozartium for the publication of the "Cosi fan tutte" to the text of Lorenzo DaPonte.

Tickets will be \$4 per person.

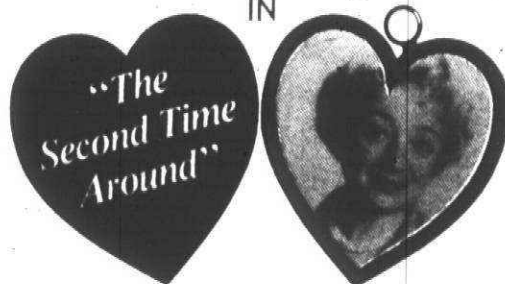

Chiefs pound WL Western for 6th win, 9-0

Plymouth Canton batsmen started slowly but picked up steam in trouncing Walled Lake Western, 9-0, in Western Six League action Monday afternoon at Canton.

The conference victory was the Chiefs' second without a loss. Coupled with a doubleheader sweep last Saturday over non-league foe Redford Union, the win gave the Chiefs a 6-0 record.

Canton coach Fred Crissey was unhappy with the way his team played against Western, saying his squad "did not come mentally ready to play." But he was quick to add that he was impressed by the team's fast start this season.

"We're hitting the ball and that's the key," the Canton mentor said.

Crissey was upset with the squad's three errors against Western—the most his club has committed in one game this season.

Canton started slowly, struggling with the weak Western squad through three scoreless innings. Then the Chiefs broke loose, scoring twice in the fourth, twice in the fifth and five more times in the sixth inning.

The Chiefs sent 10 men to the plate in the sixth, scoring all five runs after the first two batters had struck out.

Russ Mandie started the rally with a single to leftfield.

Mandie moved to third on a single by catcher Jeff Campbell. Campbell's single was his second of the game and his 11th hit in 18 trips to the plate this season—an impressive .611 batting average.

Mandie scored on a passed ball and

Campbell came home on a single by Scott Dawson to make the score 6-0. Scott Collins and Doug Smith both walked to load the bases. Dale Albright's fly ball to centerfield was dropped on the next play, scoring Dawson and Collins with the seventh and eighth runs. Smith scored the last

Despite some good individual performances, including two new school records, the Plymouth Canton boys' track team lost to non-conference foe Livonia Bentley, 104-54, Monday afternoon at the Bentley track. The loss dropped the Chiefs dual-meet record to 0-2.

Brent Eckles and Rich Fleischer were both double-winners and record-breakers for Canton.

Dan McGinn tied for first in the high jump with a leap of 5-6. He also placed third in the 440-yard dash in :54.38 and fourth in the 220-yard dash in :24.5.

Senior tri-captain Andy Lewis took second place in both the shot-put and discus events with tosses of 41-7 and 130-9, respectively.

Martin Hinckley won the 330-yard low hurdles in :42.08 and placed fourth in the 120-yard high hurdles in :19.26.

Bryan Pijanowski took third in the 120-yard high hurdles and fourth in the 330-yard low hurdles.

Dave Spitz finished fourth in both the mile and two in 5:07.8 and 10:46.0, respectively.

Al Oszewski and Frank Kellogg placed third and fourth in the shot-put respectively. John Spelich finished fourth in the discus.

Dave Talaga took third in the high jump. John Tarr placed fourth in the long jump, and Phil Simons finished fourth in the 880-yard run.

Canton travels to Farmington Harrison this afternoon for a Western Six League meet to begin at 3:30 p.m. with the field events. The running events will follow at 4 p.m.

Error given to glove?

runners advanced safely to load the bases.

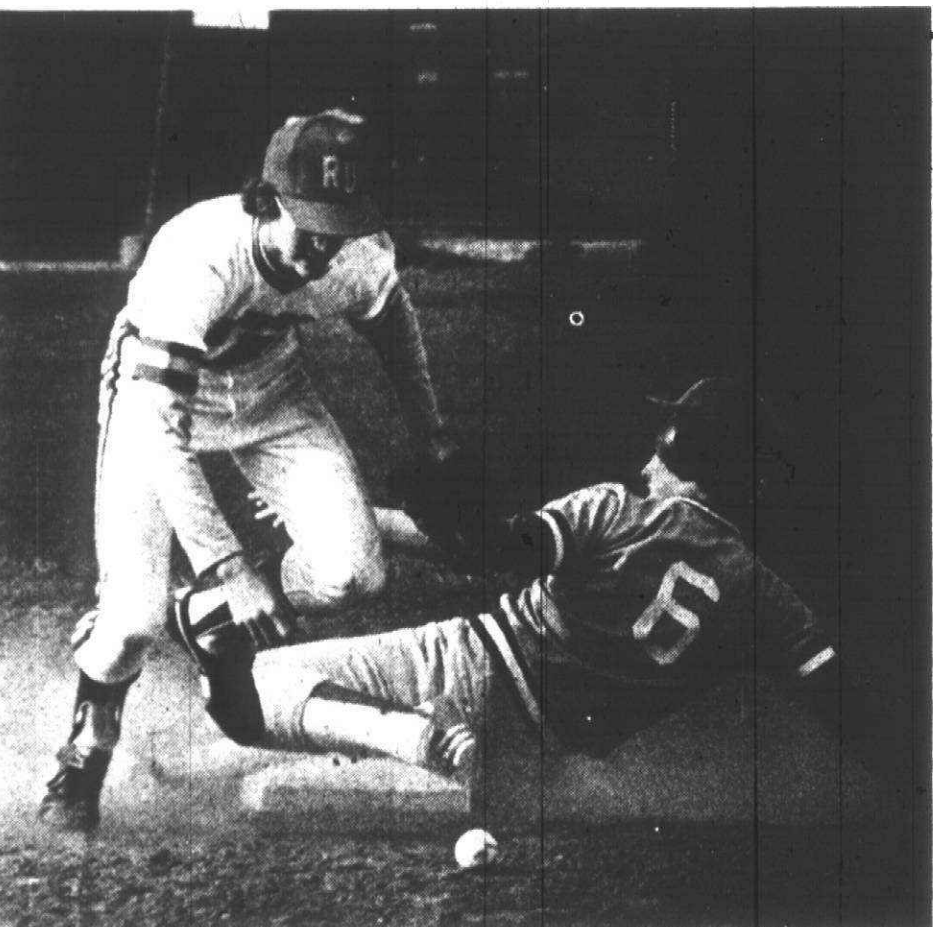
Dale's father, Dave Albright, was the official scorer at the game and wasn't quite sure to give an error to his son or to the faulty glove.

Canton girls finally play; dumped by Warriors

After three rained-out attempts to open the softball season, Plymouth Canton finally got underway Monday afternoon and lost, 8-6, to Walled Lake Western.

Chief coach Joan Ryan wasn't discouraged by the loss, however, since Walled Lake Western had three games under its belt prior to meeting the Chiefs.

"Actually, we played well for the first time this season," Ryan said. "We had only one bad inning."

The Chiefs led 3-2, after four innings, behind the strong pitching of Lucy Howe.

But the Warriors broke the game wide open in the fifth with a five-run spurt. Canton committed a series of mental throwing errors when Western had players on base.

The Chiefs closed the 7-3 gap with one run in the bottom of the fifth and two more in the sixth inning. Western added an insurance run in the sixth.

Losing pitcher Howe went all the way for the Chiefs.

She also teamed with Judy Frieman to pace Canton's nine-hit offensive attack with two safeties each.

Canton scored two runs in the third inning when Frieman's bases loaded single scored Howe and Vickie Cavallaro. Frieman was credited with only one RBI, however, since Cavallaro scored on a throwing error after the hit.

Canton scored one more in the fourth when Valerie Harben was safe on an error, moved to third on Chery Pijanowski's double, and scored on a single by Howe. The Chiefs' fourth run came in the fifth when junior shortstop Kathie Peck walked, stole second base, went to third on a ground out, and scored on a wild pitch.

Frieman's triple in the sixth inning scored Cathy Campbell with the fifth run of the game. Frieman later scored on an error.

Peck highlighted a strong defensive performance by the Chiefs as she threw out the first five of six Western who players who came to bat.

In a game marred by a multitude of errors and wild pitching on both sides, Redford Union outlasted Plymouth Salem, 8-7, in Suburban Eight League action Tuesday afternoon in Redford.

Not only was this the first Sub-8 loss of the season for Salem, but it also marked the first time since 1975 that the Rocks have lost to Bob Atkins' Panthers.

Salem, 4-3 winners over Belleville one day earlier in a make-up contest, travelled to Panther country with hopes of keeping their 2-0 league record clean. But it didn't happen.

Rock coach Brian Gilles said before the game that he had a funny feeling something would go wrong against the Panthers and his prediction couldn't have been closer to the truth.

After the first three innings, the Rocks found themselves in a 4-4 deadlock.

Salem scored twice in the fourth to grab a 6-4 lead but watched RU battle back with two in the bottom of the fourth to knot things at 6-6. The Rocks once again went ahead in the fifth, scoring one run to take a 7-6 lead.

But Panther catcher Dale McDonald slapped a two-run double off Salem reliever and loser John Holdsworth in the bottom of the sixth inning to win the game.

The Rocks had numerous chances to break the game wide open but left 13 men on base—nine in the first three innings—as a 12-hit attack was wasted.

"There's just no way we should have lost to RU," Said Gilles after watching his club drop to a 3-3 overall record. "I just don't know what to say."

Salem finished the game with six errors. Doug Holloway, the starting pitcher, Sam Merrill, and Bubba Wilcox paced the offensive attack with two hits each.

The Belleville game started as a laughter but ended up being very close after the Rocks blew the 4-0 lead they had after three innings. Salem hung on to defeat the Tigers, 4-3, for their second Suburban Eight League victory of the season.

Salem jumped to a quick 3-0 lead in the initial inning when starting pitcher Bruce Piper help his own cause with a three-run blast over the left-centerfield fence, scoring Paul Dillon and Bob Waite ahead of him.

Piper smacked a three-two pitch 365 feet away, giving the Rocks an early lead.

Salem added its last run in the bottom of the third when Matt Etienne walked and went to third on a single by Waite. Clean-up hitter Bubba Wilcox then grounded to shortstop scoring Etienne from third.

Belleville finally got a run off Piper in the fourth inning, but the Rocks still held a 4-1 lead when Piper was lifted in the fifth.

Barry Owens came into the game in relief and didn't allow the Tigers to score in the fifth or sixth innings. A walk and an error in the top of the seventh got Owens into trouble, however, as Belleville put its first two runners on base.

A fielder's choice plus another error scored two Tiger runs to close the gap at 4-3, and Owens was lifted with one out and a runner on third base. Doug Holloway came into the contest and walked the first batter he faced before getting the next two batters out on fly balls to protect Piper's victory.

Top prep cagers compete

While the high school basketball season officially ended in March, a handful of Michigan cagers will play what probably will be one of the most memorable games of their career May 6.

That is the date on which a Michigan AAU Youth Team will meet the National Junior Russian Team at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.

Tip-off time is 8 p.m. Tickets, at \$5 per person, will be available at the door of the physical education building or may be purchased in advance at the same site.

Tickets may also be obtained at metro area Hudson stores.

Schoolcraft is located at 18600 Haggerty between Six and Seven Mile.

The Michigan team consists of selected high school seniors, most of whom have been named to various all-state teams.

They include Rob Gonzalez, from Detroit Catholic Central, Keith Smith, Detroit Mackenzie, Walker D. Russell, Pontiac Central, Joe Kopicki, Warren Fitzgerald, and Cedric Olden, Highland Park.

The Soviet team will also be comprised of high-school-age players.

The Livonia stop will be the second during a seven-city, 11-day tour for the Soviet contingent primarily through the Midwest. The visitors will arrive at Metropolitan Airport May 5 and spend two nights at the Red Roof Inn in Plymouth Township.

No formal sightseeing tours or activities are planned while the Soviets are in the area.

Preceding the feature game will be an all-star contest involving a host of players who gained all-Observer & Eccentric or honorable mention accolades this season.

Included on the Oakland County team are Scott Russell, from Southfield, Harold Beardsley, North Farmington, and Ronnie Washington, Birmingham Brother Rice.

The Wayne County squad includes Dave Decoster, Redford Bishop Burgess, Tom Ellinghausen, Plymouth

Salem, Bill Peterson, Clarenceville, and Dave Stone, Livonia Bentley.

The preliminary game will get underway at 6 p.m.

A unusual feature of both games is that they will be played by international rules.

Some of the significant differences are 20-minute halves instead of eight-minute quarters, a 30-second shot clock, an extended three-second lane and the bonus rule in effect after the 10th foul of the half instead of the fifth.

Both games are co-sponsored by the Michigan Basketball Association, a non-profit corporation dedicated to promoting international and national amateur basketball for Michigan, and Schoolcraft College.

It's tennis time again

Tennis anyone? That familiar cry will soon be heard in growing fury throughout the area as the public tennis courts open for spring and summer.

There are many facilities to choose from. One can play at an area high school or at courts in city parks. Wherever there is a court, it's bound to be open for play and crowded by early May at the latest.

Westland has four public courts at 6210 Wildwood open for play beginning May 2. Hours are 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. weekdays and 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. weekends. Courts are assigned on a first-come-first-served basis with the busiest times being weekends. There is no charge.

Besides the courts at both East and West High Schools, Garden City has four courts at Moeller Park at Moeller and Block. The courts are open every

day until dark. There is no charge to play.

Livonia has an abundance of tennis courts, 42 all told. They are free and open from sunrise to sunset.

Bicentennial Park on Seven Mile has eight courts. Rotary Park on Six Mile has six courts, while there are two courts each at Blue Grass Park on Hix north of Five Mile, Compton Park on Lyndon, Castle Gardens also on Lyndon, and Country Home Park on Yale south of Plymouth.

Sheldon Park has eight courts and there are also four courts at Five Mile and Newburgh next to the shopping center.

The Livonia courts are busy every day, especially Sunday.

Free courts are also available at all the high schools—Stevenson, Bentley, Franklin and Churchill.

Edward Hines Parkway also has 20 public courts.

At most courts there is a posted

rules board with the most important rule being that playing time is limited to one hour per group.

There are four courts at the Northville Recreation area, six at the Haggerty area, four at Inkster road, and two each at Nankin Mills, Beech Daly and Warren Dale drive.

Redford Township has courts at three locations: Capital Park, at Hemmingway and Capital (four), Phoenix Park (two) and Kraft Park (two).

Also in Redford but under county jurisdiction are the four courts at Belle Creek Park, Five Mile at Inkster. The courts are open all day and have no charge. According to Roger Nordstrom, parks and recreation director for Redford, Belle Creek and Capital Park are the busiest courts in Redford.

Plymouth has no municipal courts, but tennis enthusiasts may play at either Plymouth Canton or Salem high schools. The courts are open days and evenings.

Wayne clobbers Salem

Canton sweeps 2 from RU

It was another doubleheader Saturday for Plymouth Canton and Plymouth Salem baseball teams but that's where the similarities ended.

The Chiefs took advantage of spotty play on the part of Redford Union to trounce the Panthers in two straight games, 12-2 and 6-2.

THE CHIEFS capitalized on the wild pitching of Redford Union's ace John

Collier, and the shaky fielding of the Panther infield to win the first game by 10 runs.

Canton was blessed with seven base-on-balls and five Panther errors enroute to the victory.

"I thought the two games with Redford Union really helped us," said Canton coach Fred Crissey. "They didn't execute well but we capitalized on the situation."

Scott Dawson, starting for the first time this season, went six innings and gave up only four hits, striking out eight and walking just one. Doug Smith relieved in the final inning and sent RU down in order.

The Panthers' only two runs were scored in the fourth and sixth innings. Meanwhile, the Chiefs were having a field day on Collier, totaling nine hits—three for Dawson, and two each for Jeff Campbell and Scott Collins.

The Chiefs scored twice in the first inning, once in the third, three times in the fifth, once in the sixth and five more times in the seventh inning.

Canton got off to another quick start in the second game, scoring once in the first inning and three more times in the second to take a 4-0 lead.

The Chiefs scored single runs in the fourth and sixth innings to close out the scoring.

Dale Albright started for the Chiefs working three-and-two-thirds innings. The Panthers scored once in the third and threatened in the fourth when Smith came in to relieve Albright and ended the rally. Smith went one-and-two-thirds innings and got the win.

Brian James hurled the last two innings and struck out five.

The Chiefs added 10 more hits in this game—two for Collins and two for Campbell.

IN WHAT Salem coach Brian Gilles called "one of the worst performances in years," the Rocks lost both ends of a doubleheader to Wayne.

Wayne's lefthanded ace Jim Canfield stopped the Rocks on only four hits in first game to record the shut out. Doug Holloway and Bruce Piper combined on the mound for Salem as three of the four Wayne runs were unearned. Salem committed four errors in the first game.

It was the same story in the second contest as the Rocks wasted two two-run homers by Sam Merrill and Piper in losing 8-5 in the nightcap. Once again, the Rocks committed four fielding errors. John Holdsworth started on the mound and suffered the loss.

Distance runners travel 164 miles

Each Chief thinclad started on Greenbriar Court and ran alone around the two-mile loop in six-mile intervals. Between turns, the boys rested in a camper all night.

Kiefer admitted he was a "little tight" for the Chiefs' non-league dual meet with Livonia Bentley Monday afternoon.

The four considered the mini-marathon a warm-up exercise in hopes of eventually raising money by running for donations for the Canton track program.

Kiefer admitted, however, the four would not attempt another 24-hour jaunt in the immediate future.

They are all too sore to think about running right now.

Fall planting is generally recommended over spring planting. Newly moved plants establish themselves during the moist days of fall and then like to go into winter with protective mulch. The mulch may be left on the bed undisturbed in the spring as the decaying leaves and other organic material only further enriches the soil. If any plant has to struggle to grow through the mulch, it is wise to remove it from around the crown, and the same applies to all the bulbs.

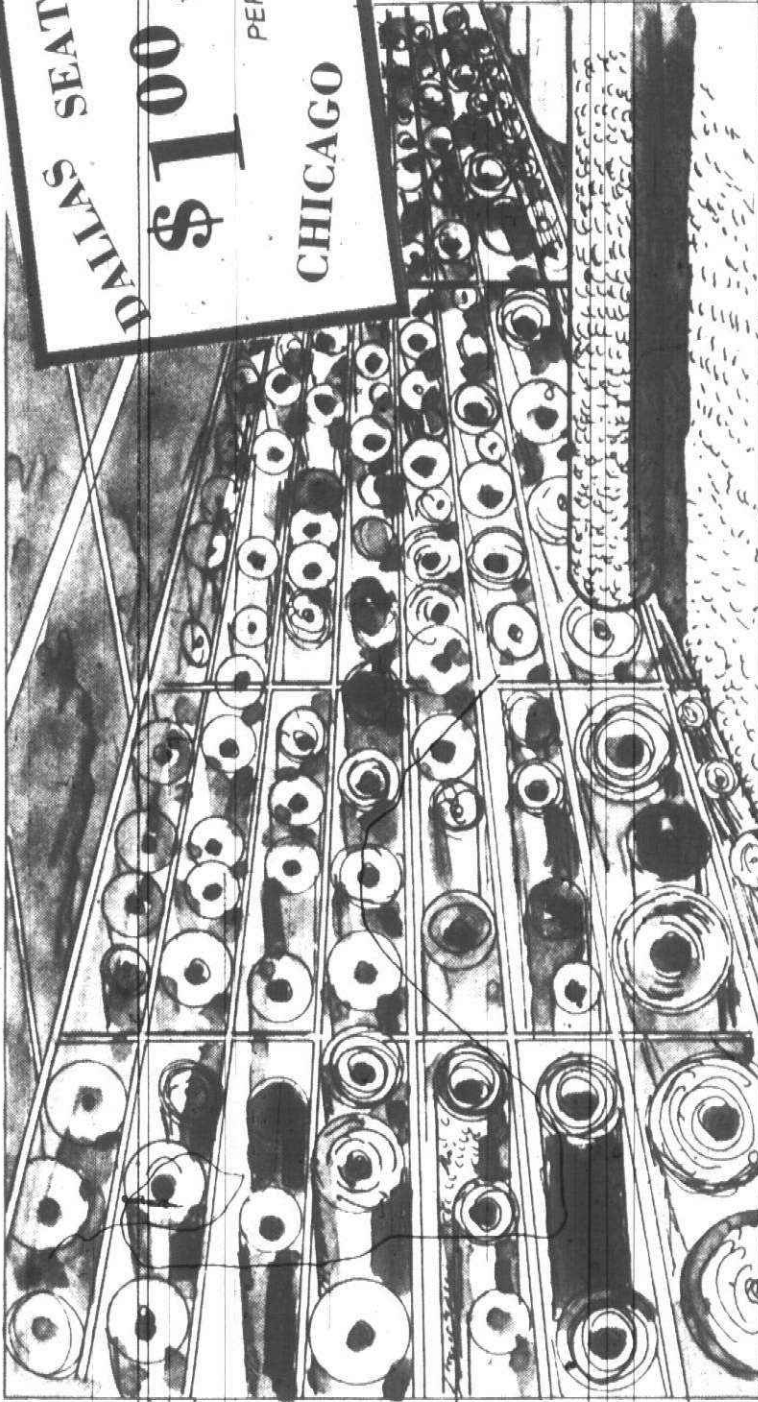
Nothing more is required of the gardener during the year except occasional extra watering in the summer. And when the season is over, that part of the garden must be allowed to lie fallow for another year, since there is a cycle in nature that must not be disguised. This quotation is from Vita-Sackville-West's "The Joy of Gardening," which I recommend for your garden library.

Let me suggest that in the beginning your wildflower garden should consist mostly of highly reliable plants. Each year you can add a few new ones which may be more difficult but which may appeal to you.

Easy-to-grow wildflowers (common names) are: Bloodroot, Great Solomon-Seal, Hepatica, Jack-in-the-Pulpit, May-Apple, Spring Beauty, Trillium, Violets, Virginia Blue Bell, Wild Geranium, Wild Ginger and Wild Phlox.



Naturally the way to go

Wildflowers:

Igor Stravinsky, when he composed "The Rites of Spring," said that winter was a long, weary eternity and spring was an hour of violent explosion. Unfortunately, Michigan winters are much like Russian winters, and our spring - when it comes - is just as brief, but oh, so beautiful.

It is in the naturalized spring garden that one is most touched by the sight of the first blooms of the new year. Each day in April one spots different varieties of the true harbingers of spring - the early bulbs and wildflowers.

To have the pleasure of an early spring naturalized garden one need not own several acres of woods or even an extensive collection of difficult-to-acquire and difficult-to-grow wildflowers. A small shady area under a large tree or under several large shrubs, or even a problem shady area on the north side of the house, can be developed with the right materials to create a woody feeling.

A thick ground cover, a few ferns and some early small bulbs are the basic beginnings for this low maintenance garden.

The familiar ground covers such as Baltic ivy, pachysandra or myrtle, practically take care of themselves and are just as decorative as that status-symbol lawn you have to slave over. Use only one kind, however, do not mix them.

Since you must allow the foliage of bulbs to die back after the blossoms die, the unsightly leaves can be easily tucked in among the ground cover and they won't even show.

Location and light requirements are important. Spring wildflowers appreciate the early spring sunshine, but as the days become hotter, they become more difficult to maintain.

Minimum maintenance is one of the chief attractions of this kind of gardening. Wildflowers are almost self-supporting. They never need spraying, fertilizing is not even generally recommended, and they want considerably less watering, thinning or handing than most flowering plants. Spring "wildings" save the gardener time, money and work. Once established, they are almost carefree and will perpetuate themselves for years.

Location and light requirements are important. Spring wildflowers appreciate the early spring sunshine, but as the days become hotter, they become more difficult to maintain.



Greenhousery

Growing under glass is gaining popularity

What is aluminum and glass and green all under? The answer, of course, is a greenhouse.

Interest in the home greenhouse is growing at phenomenal speed, but knowledge of greenhouses has not kept up with the interest, and prospective greenhouse owners have many questions. Just learning the vocabulary of greenhouses is a step toward better understanding of the fastest growing hobby in America.

To the question of what is a greenhouse, it's a specialized structure designed to provide totally controlled environment for the well-being and promotion of plant life.

There are basically two styles of greenhouses: the even span and the lean-to. The old estate conservatory has given way to these modern greenhouses which actually are a gracious extension of the home.

The even span greenhouse has glass on both sides of the high point (or ridge) and can be attached to an existing building at one end of the gable, or it can be erected as a separate free standing structure. A lean-to is one-half of a greenhouse as it always

requires shading in the summer. Building your own greenhouse isn't as hard as it sounds. Many people who are handy have followed the assembly instructions and have successfully built their own greenhouse. Some folks have

done all or part of the masonry, heating, plumbing and electrical work themselves and then called in experts to erect the glass and aluminum superstructure. But even that part can be done successfully by the handyman-gardener.

Heating, cooling, shading, light, air movement, air exchange and humidity are the major environmental factors to be considered in a greenhouse.

Controlling excessive heat is important to maintain the proper temperatures in greenhouse gardening. There are two systems for lowering the temperatures which supplement the year-round overhead vents for cooling and air exchange.

The cooling system for a greenhouse is called a "wet pad" evap-

orative cooler and is placed just outside the greenhouse. The fan draws outside air through the wet pads into the greenhouse. Water is piped into the cooler and a pump circulates the water through the wet pads.

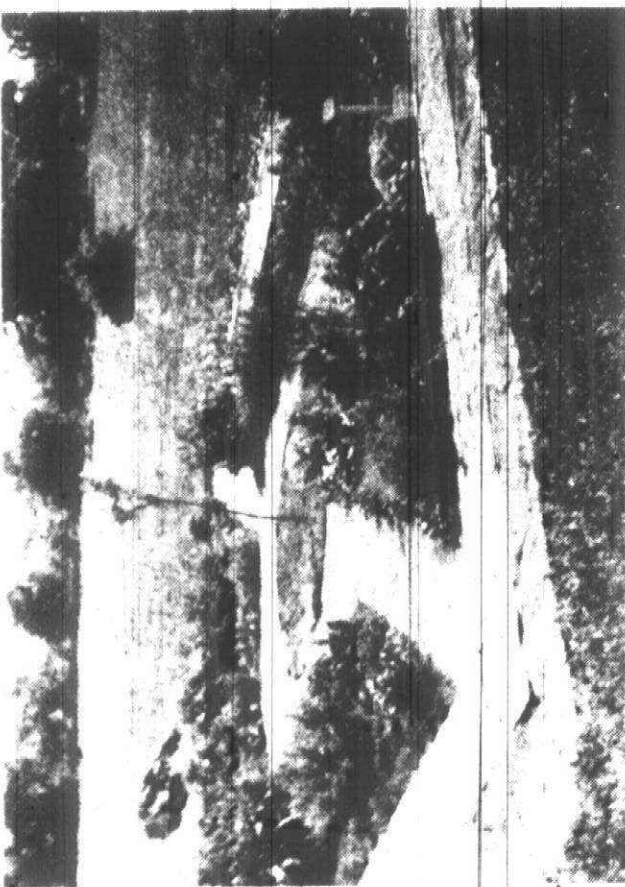
Visitors at the herb garden at Greenmead, Livonia's historical site are invited to see — sniff — and even "snitch" to help determine what to plant.

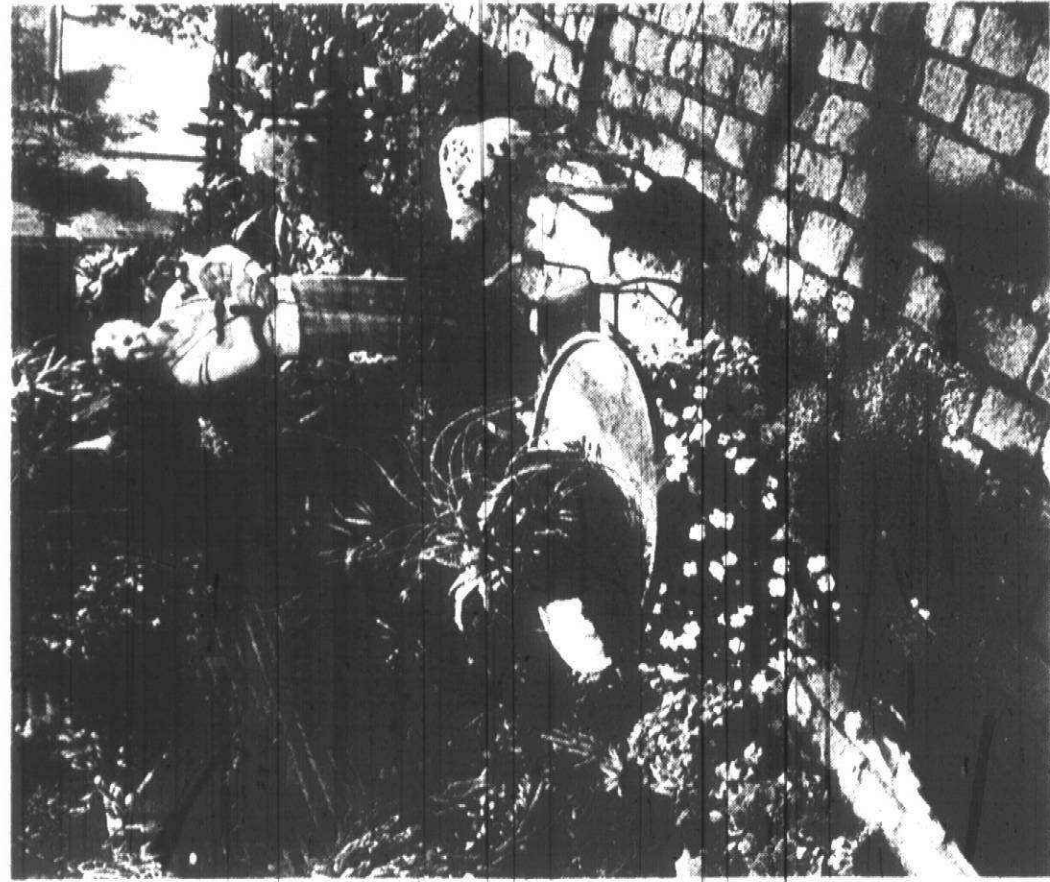

Herb gardens

Put some spice in your
life and on your table

Herb gardening can be an enjoyable hobby.

There is such an abundance of plants to choose from: some with narrow foliage, some have very broad foliage, some tiny leaves, ferny leaves, some soft and velvety. Besides there are the various colors of leaves: gray, purple, variegated, gold, bluish green, dark green or light green. Many also have very attractive flowers.

Man has used herbs for numerous things since ancient time—for culinary seasoning, for medicines, for fragrance, as potpourri and sachet; the dried or green leaves are used for teas. Some are sources for dyes.

Plant some herbs to decorate your garden and use them.

First, it's well to decide whether to have a separate herb garden or just a few, or many. They lend themselves to most any situation: in a border of perennials or annuals. They can be set among the shrubs.

Some, as santalinos and lavenders, can be used as shrubs where they would brighten a spot.

A formal herb garden can be a beautiful spot if space and time permit. An herb garden requires more planning and soil prepara-

tion than just digging here and there for a few plants to be put in.

The initial spading or rototilling and layout of the formal garden, then filling it with plants taken in time, but is well worth the enjoyment the garden would bring for many years.

The most commonly grown herbs require no special care, like a hot, sunny place, ordinary or poor soil. They have few insect and fungus enemies.

A good many, though, are rampant-growers, such as the mints, and they should be placed with this in mind, if mixed with other plants. They can soon crowd out less vigorous things.

When transplanting herbs, as with all plants, they should be watered well until established. After they have had time to get going, they will require little water.

Twelve useful and attractive perennial herbs for beginners are suggested:

—Bergamot — Monarda didyma, to four feet tall, fragrant, showy, red bracts in summer, good as cut flowers.
—Catmint — Nepeta mussinii, to a foot or so. Lavender-blue flowers all summer. Cats like it, but

not as much as N. cataria, which can be very weedy.

—Chive — Allium schoenoprasum, one foot tall with lilac-pink flower. An onion-like plant with mild flavor, can be potted and grown inside for winter use.

—Feverfew — Chrysanthemum parthenium—one to two feet tall, many small "mums" for a long period in summer, white, dried flowers used as medicine.

—Lavender — Lavandula officinalis, fragrant, gray, shrubby, purple-blue flower spikes, use in potpourri, sachets, flower arrangements, dried or fresh.

—Lavender Cotton — Santolina Chamaecyparissus one foot or taller, much cut gray foliage, very decorative "button" flowers are yellow, like tansy but on long stem.

—Majoram — Origanum onites, medium tall, reddish cast to leaves, used for flavoring salads, sauces and soups.

—Sage — Salvia officinalis, to two feet, has soft gray foliage, or "purple" or "golden" varieties, dried leaves used as pork, poultry, stuffing seasoning.

—Silvermound — Artemisia

attached to a hose, or an automatic self-contained unit are available. Many people find it quite satisfactory to water the floor and under the bench and then allow the moisture to rise.

How much time does a greenhouse require? The amount of leisure time you have and the extent of your interest will determine the time you will spend on your new hobby. Some people devote as little as 15 minutes every other day and others spend several hours of creative gardening daily.

Another facet of greenhouse gardening is how the structure will affect property values. Although you are building the greenhouse for your own pleasure, a home greenhouse definitely enhances the property value. At the time of resale, the greenhouse will help sell the house to a real gardener, of whom there are a growing number.

The first advice to prospective greenhouse owners is to build a greenhouse as large as possible. A small greenhouse will look tremendous for a while, but as your hobby expands, you'll regret not having built a larger one. The cost of a greenhouse and equipment does not double as the size is doubled.

The major costs of a greenhouse are the masonry, heating, plumbing and electricity, and they will

be the same whether you build a fine or a poor greenhouse.

There is no good rule of thumb on how to estimate the cost of a greenhouse. There are too many variables. By contacting a local professional greenhouse representative and discussing your greenhouse ideas with him, you can then get a true perspective of the total cost of your individual greenhouse.

It's safe to assume that the construction of a greenhouse usually costs about the same as a new room of comparable size, if not done by the owner.

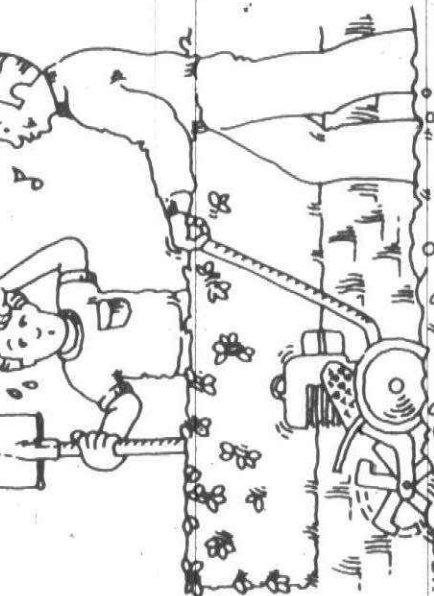

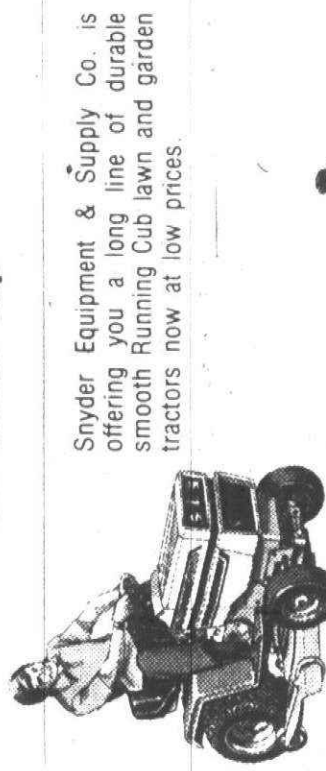
It's hard to move a tree after you've planted it or change the location of a walkway after the concrete is poured. So cure these landscape mistakes with prevention.

"Before you make a permanent change in your landscape, try out some way to be sure it's what you want," suggests Joe Cox, extension landscape architecture specialist at MSU.

Mark proposed changes with stakes and string or a length of garden hose, he says. Or take a picture of your home, blow it up to an 8-by-10 and draw proposed changes on clear plastic overlay. You can also project a slide of the property onto a blackboard or large sheet of paper and sketch in changes you think you'd like. "All this calls for a little imagination, of course," Cox notes. "After all, a row of stakes and string doesn't look a lot like a patio or hedge. But they're a lot easier to pick up and move if you decide you don't like what you see."

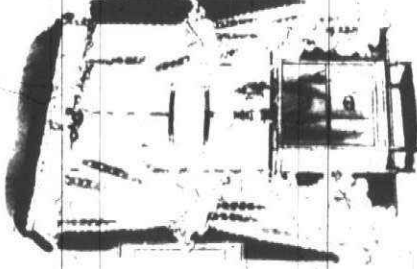

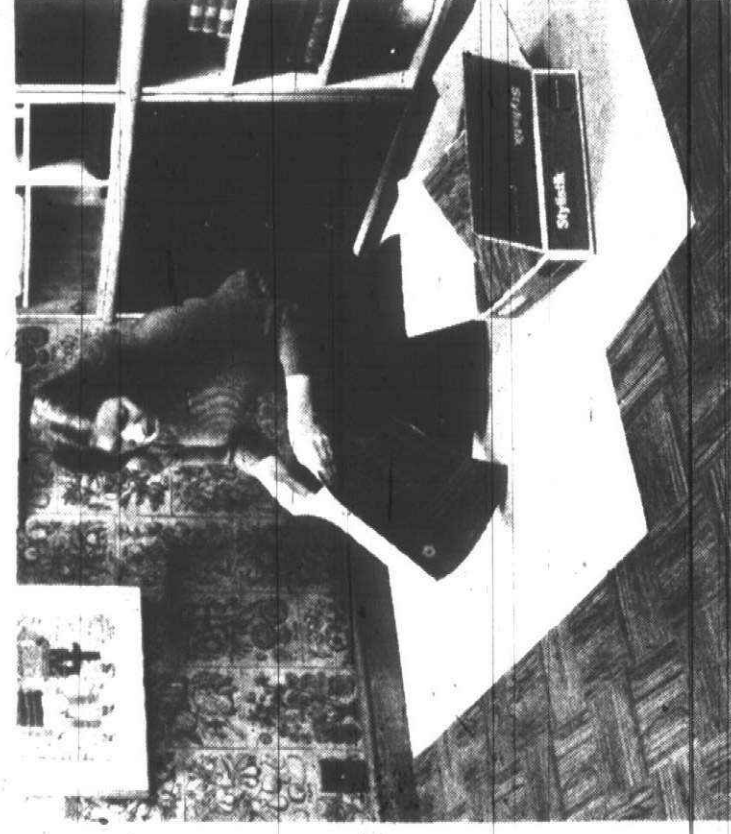

Couple or crowd Rub-a-Dub in hot tub

The butcher, the baker and the candlestick maker whose rub-a-dub tubbing have endeared them to generations of school children are gaining a broader constituency.

"Hot tubs" are in. Evolving from the popular home spa and therapeutic whirlpool bath, "hot tubs" were developed a few years ago in California and now, according to the National Swimming Pool Institute, are gaining in popularity all across the country.

The tubs are something like open barrels, generally constructed of redwood, but also available in oak or aspen. They range in diameter from four to 10 feet and may be installed indoors or outdoors.

In most models, water is pumped in through jets and continuously recycled. Water temperatures can be varied to suit the tastes of the tubbers.

While "hot tubs" are a relatively new development, the principle has been around for a long time.

Loosen soil to awaken lazy roots

Have you ever lost a perfectly healthy plant even though you carefully followed the planting instructions?

A beautiful azalea or rhododendron grown in a can or a burlap bag lowered into the proper size hole and carefully watered later dies for no apparent reason.

But when you excavate to test it out, the diagnosis is very clear. The roots stopped growing and the plant just died. The original soil mass never made any growth out into its new surroundings and that's what is meant by "lazy roots."

It is believed that many plants have real difficulty penetrating from one type of soil into another, even if the new type of medium is considered superior. To make the transition easier, there are several things you can do:

- Loosen the soil of the hole into which the plant is to be placed.
- Soak the entire plant, not just the roots, for several hours and with your fingers separate the roots gently. This will loosen the soil and help prevent them from continuing their growth in the same circular pattern they followed in the container.

- If the soil ball is a dense mass of roots that have actually outgrown their container, separate them even more and trim some of them.

- If you remove much of the root system, cut off an equal amount of the top growth.

- Place the wet and loosened soil ball into the carefully prepared hole and fill in around the roots with the ground soil. Mixing the two soils at point of contact helps the roots to cope with the "interface" normally caused when two different soils meet.

There is some evidence that soaking the shrub or plant in quite warm water will act as a further stimulant or adjustment and a healthy root development.

Excellent results have been reported by adding Ortho's Up-Start 5-15-5 to this pre-planting water and then using it as a booster fertilizer for several applications. The higher proportion of phosphorus in the formula (5 phosphorus, 15 phosphorus, 5 potassium) plus the hormone-like root stimulator promote earlier and stronger root structure and seems to reduce transplanting shock.

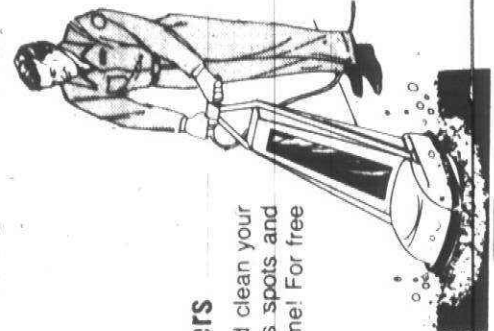
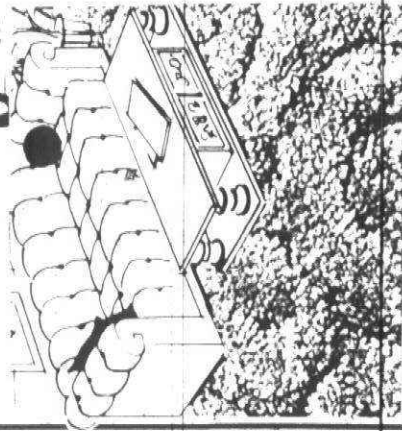

Fern garden: Lush and green (and practically pest-free)

If you would like a cool tropical hideaway corner, create a fern garden. Ferns are a care-free, perennial, shade plant. Their one requirement is moisture and they prefer shade, but will tolerate some sun. Just like any other garden, it will flourish if the requirements are met.

Ferns planted in a wooded area will do fine because this is their natural habitat. The leaf mold and mulch are already there. If the summer gets really hot and dry and there is no natural stream, extra watering will help because trees take up the moisture.

To create a fern area on a city lot requires a little more work. A natural setting is pool or fountain, but any shady spot that does not get the hot dry breeze from a city street will do.

Hot dry air makes ferns turn brown. An isolated spot to the back of the house, garage or a shrub-sheltered area are ideal for fern gardens.

The ground should be worked up by spading in lots of leaves, peat and rotted wood. A few bushels of fresh soil from the woods will also be a great help.

One thing to remember, however, is not to use any fertilizers or sprays on ferns because they are tender and have a natural built-in resistance to pests. The area can be prepared a season before or planted right away. Either way, always keep the area moist.

Lady Fern should be divided quite often because it is pretty only as an individual plant.

An interesting phase of ferns is the development of the spores. This development is often mistaken for disease or even insects.

All ferns grow a sterile and a fertile frond. These spores look like brown dust. The ostrich and sensitive ferns are different. Their fertile fronds are a stout short spike. This spike remains upright long into the winter and is very often used in dried arrangements.

Each of the Osmunda ferns is unique and has a spore-producing style all of their own. Once you observe all of these strange happenings to your ferns, you will learn to identify the different plants.

Wild flowers or shade-loving flowering perennials are good companion plants for a fern garden, but all-green garden always looks so lush and cool.

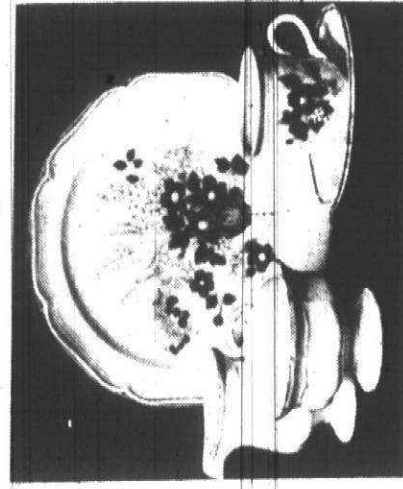
