## Totals change in official tally

The Canton Township primary election is official.

The board of canvassers certified vote tallies Thursday night. And, while the official count won't make winners out of any of the losers, the final tally in three races was different than the figures released to the public election night.

Thursday's certification went off without a hitch. It was quite a contrast to the 1976 certification count which was incomplete because totals in the absentee ballot precinct did not match with the number of voters registered to vote in that precinct.

Precinct workers in the absentee precinct made the mistake of casting their own votes on machines that were only to be used to tabulate paper, absentee ballots. A subsequent request for a recount was impossible because of this human error.

Maria Falkiewicz, a newcomer to Canton politics who pulled off an upset by unseating incumbent treasurer Anne Bradley in the bid for the Democratic nomination, gained 35 votes in the certification check.

The final tally showed that she beat Mrs. Bradley 1,412 votes to 1,239. Mrs. Falkiewicz will face the Republican nominee for treasurer, James Donahue, in the general election Nov. 8.

Carol Bodenmiller, the second-highest vote-getter in the Democrat race for two trustee positions, lost two votes in the certification check. Final tallies show that she picked up 1,134 votes instead of 1,136 as previously reported. The new figure does not affect her standing in the race.

Sally Mundo picked up another 10 votes in her unsuccessful write-in bid for the second trustee spot on the Republican side of the ballot. She officially received 21 votes, not 11, but it is still not enough to win her a place on the November ballot. Write-in candidates in a primary must receive 15 per cent of the announced candidate's vote total.

For the record, two other write-in candidates for trustee appeared on the Republican side of the ballot surfaced in the certification check. In addition to Robert Binkowski and Donald Ferguson, who got a single vote apiece, Ronald Adpat and Barbara Percha each received one vote.

And six write-in candidates turned up in the race for constable, a non-voting position in the township.

### OFFICIAL RESULTS are:

**Supervisor**—Noel Culbert, 1,663; Harold Stein, 1,077 on the Democratic side of the ticket and 547 votes for John Longridge, Republican candidate for supervisor in the November election.

**Clerk**—Democrat John Flodin, unopposed in either party, 1,720 votes.

**Treasurer**—Democrats Maria Falkiewicz, 1,412 votes; Anne Bradley, 1,239. Republican nominee James Donahue, 544 votes.

**Trustees**—(two nominated in each

## Stein mum on his plans for future

"I feel like someone has taken a big stone from around my neck," said a relaxed Supervisor Harold Stein the day after he was defeated at the polls. "I don't know what I'm going to do after my term expires. But I'm not worried about it either."

Last Tuesday, Stein lost the Democratic nomination for supervisor to Canton attorney Noel Culbert by an overwhelming margin.

**BUT STEIN SAYS** he has not let the election results get him down.

"I made my position very clear on how I looked at things," said Stein as he toyed with a pencil on his desk. "If that's not what the people want, why should I want to serve?"

Stein maintains, however, that his ouster is not a clear mandate from the majority of Canton residents. Less than 23 per cent of Canton's registered voters turned up at the polls last Tuesday.

"Some people called me up after the election and said they didn't vote because they thought I had it made," Stein said.

Stein will sit in the supervisor's chair for the last time on Nov. 20.

**THE OUSTED OFFICIAL** says he will probably take a long vacation after his term ends and then will start to plan his future.

The 47-year-old Stein is the owner of

party) Democrats Robert Greenstein, 1,433 votes; Carol Bodenmiller, 1,134; also-rans Larry Bowerman, 952; Frank McMurray, 913; and Robert Schaeztl, 646. Republican nominee Gary Roberts received 540 votes while unsuccessful Republican write-in candidates received the following: Sally Mundo, 21 votes; Robert Binkowski, 1; Donald Ferguson, 1; Ronald Adpat, 1; and Barbara Percha, 1.

The two Democratic constables nominated in the primary and unopposed in the general election are Irene Murphy with 1,268 votes and Jack Blewins with 1,183. Democrat Sam Natoli came in third place with 774 votes. Democratic write-in candidate Timothy Murphy picked up 31 votes for constable. Republican write-in candidates receiving a single vote apiece included S. Boucher, Clifford Chilson, C. Andrews, Harold Winter, D. LaFramboise, and D. LaFramboise, Jr.

**PROPOSITIONS** on the ballot were officially certified too. The civil service question passed by a vote of 2,076 to 936.

The one-mill library levy was rejected by a vote of 1,901 to 1,111.

Three of the four members of the Canton Township Board of Canvassers certified the election. Democrats Vern Rorabacher and John L. Blumenshine signed the official tally and Ralph Burch represented the Republican party. The fourth member of the board of canvassers, Republican Floyd Fulford, is recuperating from cancer treatment and could not make an appearance.

## Politics is a revolving door in Canton

Politicians come and politicians go. The revolving door of Canton politics has apparently swung around again.

Just two years ago, former Supervisor Robert Greenstein took what he then called a permanent exit from Canton politics after narrowly losing a write-in campaign for township supervisor.

As Greenstein left township hall, Stein walked in.

Last Tuesday, voters did it again. Stein and his teammates were shoved away by a substantial vote margin, while Greenstein and the ideas he represents won an overwhelming primary victory.

**STEIN'S DEFEAT** at the polls last Tuesday can partially be attributed to the criticisms directed at the supervisor from all directions in the primary campaign.

Candidates have admitted to gang-ing up on the incumbent supervisor for the sole purpose of removing Stein from office.

But Tuesday's Democratic primary results may also mean that a substantial segment of Canton voters are tired of the views that Stein represents.

Republican candidates all ran unopposed and were assured a spot on the November ballot. Although Greenstein has stepped back into the political arena as a trustee candidate, the former supervisor represents many views that Stein opposes.

Greenstein strongly endorses the preservation of farmland; Stein has taken a lukewarm position on that issue. Greenstein engineered the township's strict sign ordinance and opposes a proposed revision to the sign law that Stein endorses.

Greenstein favors a much tougher position with home builders than Stein has taken. Greenstein and some other candidates have accused the present administration of spending too much township money for such purchases as the Fellow Creek Golf Course and for industrial park land.

Voters gave Greenstein 1,433 votes to make him the top vote-getter in the five-way Democratic race for two trustee seats. Greenstein received 356 more votes in a five-way race for two trustee nominations than Stein did in the two-man race for the Democratic supervisor nomination.

Carol Bodenmiller, a member of what was once known as the Greenstein camp, also received a higher tally in the Democratic trustee race than Stein did in the supervisor's race. She won 1,136 votes to make her the second top vote-getter in the Democratic trustee primary.

Ironically, this year's Democrat nominee for supervisor—Noel Culbert—campaigns for Stein and against Greenstein in the 1978 election. In 1976, Culbert withdrew his support for the incumbent supervisor. In the primary, he launched an anti-Stein campaign.

Culbert received 66 per cent of the

Democratic votes cast for supervisor or 1,663 votes to Stein's 1,077. Culbert admits, however, that many votes he received on his tally probably reflects more of an anti-Stein than pro-Culbert sentiment.

The same could possibly be true of Maria Falkiewicz's success in the Democratic primary. She narrowly beat incumbent Treasurer Anne Bradley—one of Stein's teammates—for the treasurer nomination.

In November, Falkiewicz will face Republican treasurer candidate Jim Donahue who was Greenstein's campaign manager in the 1976 election.

**THE LOW VOTER** turnout last Tuesday probably did not help Stein in his bid for reelection. Residents often do not bother to vote if they are satisfied with current government policies.

Nevertheless, Stein succeeded in carrying only four of the township's 17 precincts.

The incumbent supervisor carried the absentee precinct by a substantial majority of votes and took the nomination in his home precinct—in the southeastern corner of the township—by a two-to-one margin.

He won a substantial victory in precinct six—an area that includes Royal Holiday Mobile Home Park near Koppernick and the township's eastern boundary. Stein also beat Culbert by one vote in Precinct 11 where Honey Tree and Stoneybrooke apartments are located.

Some precincts that opted for Stein in 1976 went for Culbert and Greenstein last Tuesday.

Voters changed their political alignment in Precinct 3 where Holiday Park Subdivision is located; Precinct 9, bounded by Ford, Cherry Hill and Lilley; and Precinct 14, located between Joy, Ford, Lilley and the C&O Railroad.

Stein even lost the support of voters in rural Precinct two in the southwestern portion of the township.

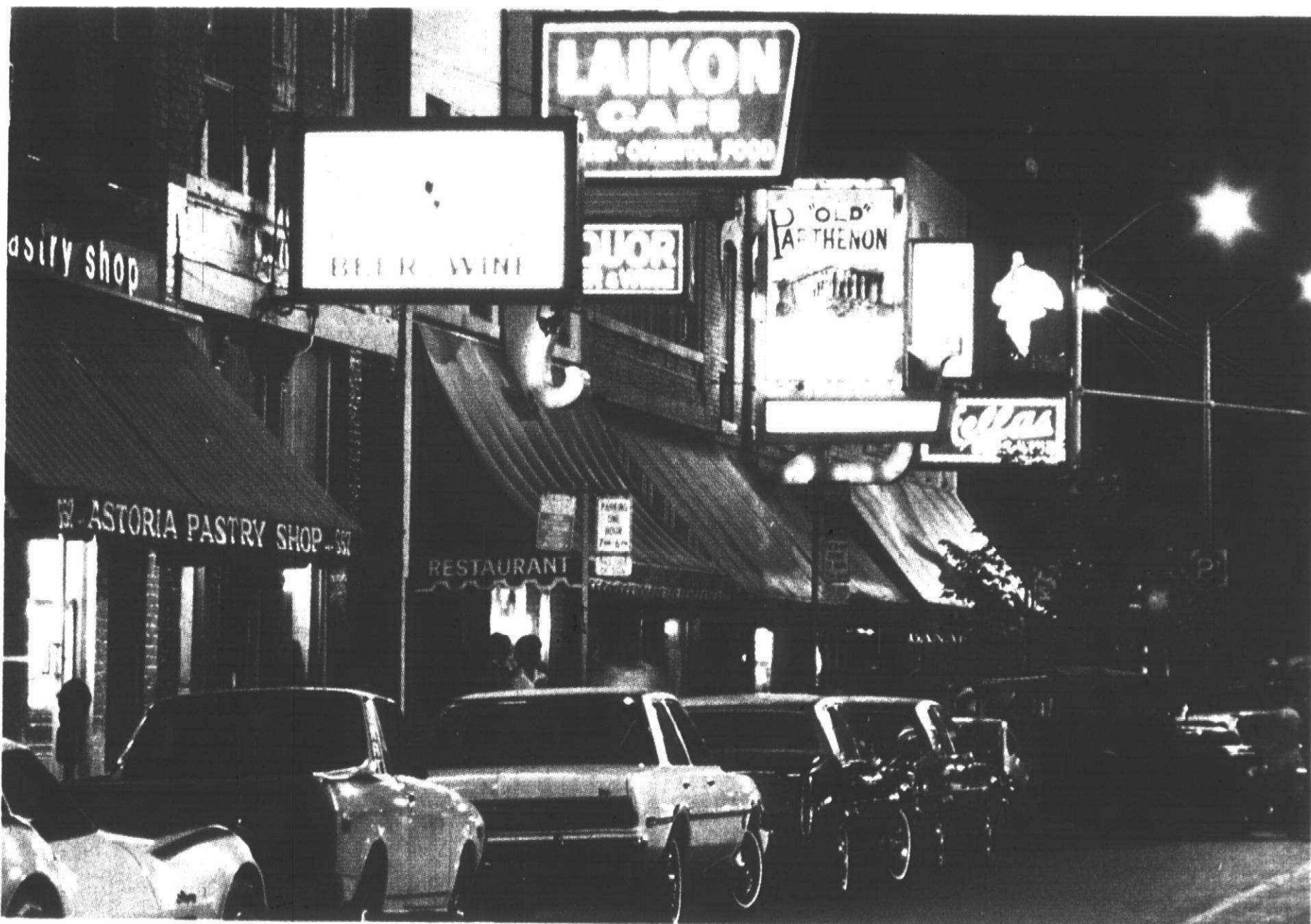
In 1976, voters there gave Stein 554 votes to Greenstein's 77 and Peter Bundarin's 201 in the three-way supervisor race.

At the time, many farmers were enraged at Greenstein's proposal to preserve their farms by lowering their tax rates and zoning their land for agricultural purposes. They wanted to be reimbursed for the development rights they would lose. Stein promised "just compensation" for farmers.

Shortly before the election, Greenstein began researching ways to purchase farmers' development rights.

Last Tuesday, however, Precinct 2 voters gave the Democratic nominations to Culbert and Greenstein. They did support two Stein slate candidates, however—incumbent Treasurer Bradley and trustee candidate Frank McMurray.

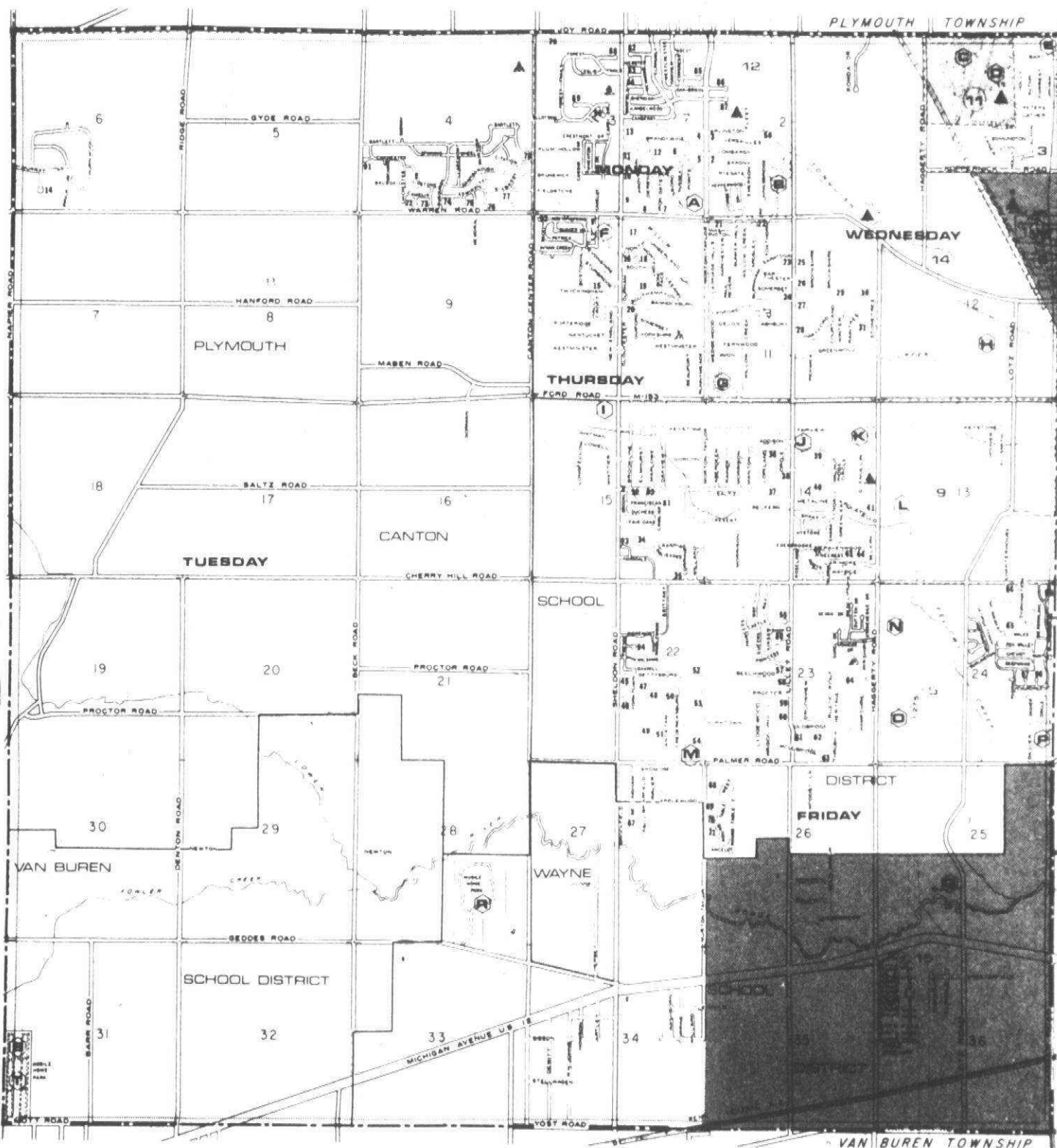
Stein also lost out in Canton's two other western precincts—numbers eight and 16.

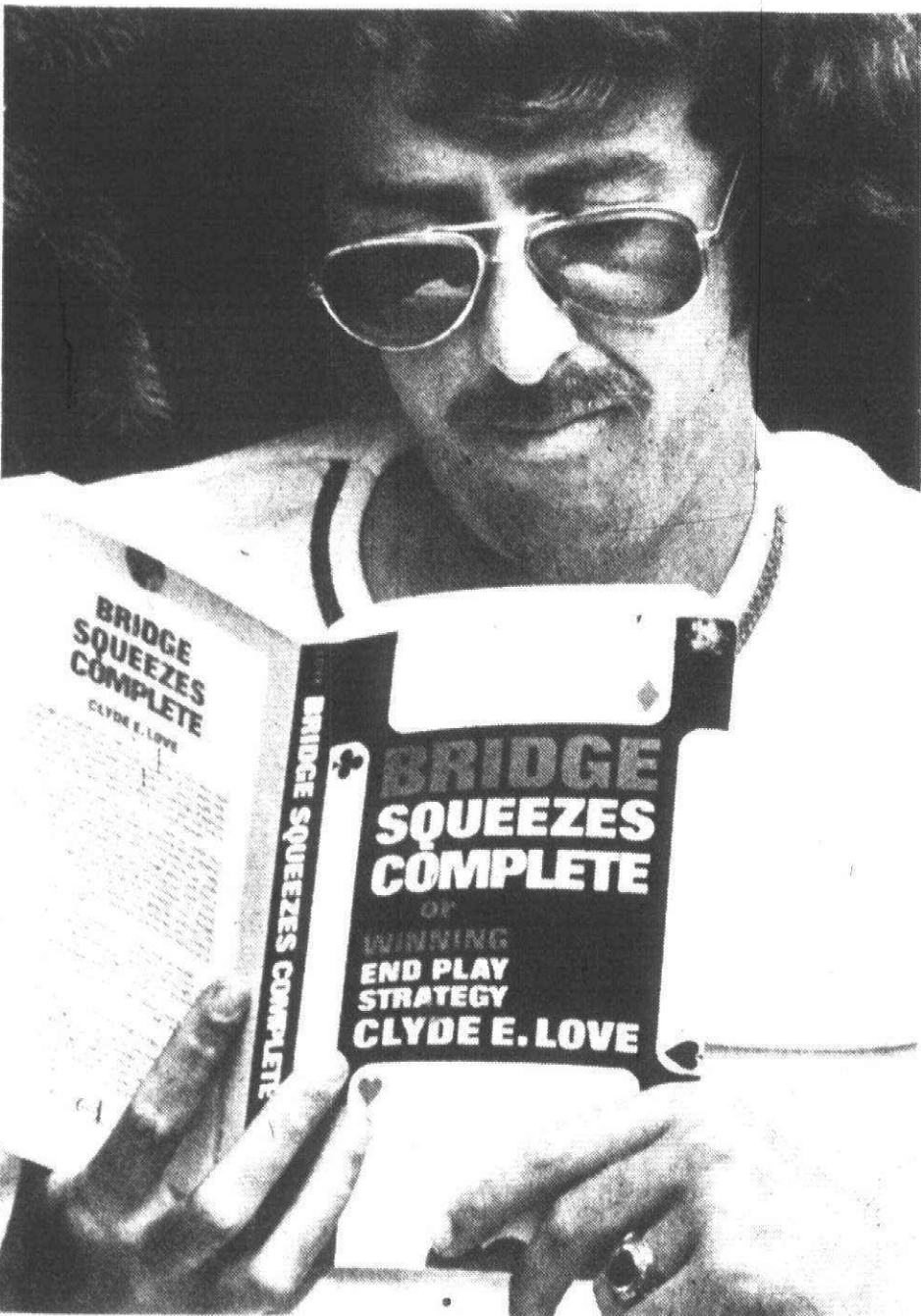

The ousted supervisor says he has no idea if he will ever run for a township office again.

Gary Roberts, Republican nominee for Canton trustee, said last Thursday's article "Bad blood flows in race" gave the erroneous implication that his candidacy was supported by Robert Greenstein, Democratic nominee for trustee and James Donahue, Republican nominee for the treasurer's job.

Roberts said that the reporter misunderstood his position. He admitted that Democrats Noel Gilbert and Robert Myers endorsed him in his bid for office but stressed that Greenstein and Donahue did not.

"What I said was that there was a coalition of people that included Greenstein and Donahue that worked to beat the Stein slate," Roberts said. "That does not mean that they endorse me or I endorse them. For God sakes, I want to see an end to slate politics in Canton."

bridge master—the highest ranking a bridge player can achieve.

A MAILMAN IN WESTLAND, Crane has competed in bridge tournaments across the country. He usually plays in two national tournaments a year and 10 regional contests.

Just recently, Crane and his bridge partner—Thomas Mauthner of Livonia—took top place in a duplicate bridge tournament sponsored by the North American Bridge Championships in Toronto.

In all, Crane has accumulated more than 1,000 master points. Bridge players need 300 to be a lifetime master.

When Crane isn't delivering mail or playing in major tournaments, he's playing bridge in local contests. When he's not playing bridge, he's usually reading books or magazines about the card game.

"I really don't do anything else,"

confessed the bridge enthusiast. "I usually play at least four nights a week and I read books about bridge at least one hour every night."

Crane began playing bridge 10 years ago when he was a student at Michigan Technological University in Houghton.

He hasn't stopped since. Crane says he loves the competitive spirit of a duplicate bridge game and the thrill of coming out on top.

In duplicate games, the same card hand is played by a number of players. Points are given to the pair of players who play an individual hand the best. Players with the most points at the end of the game receive master points as winners.

Crane says the entry fee in most local duplicate games is about \$2.

"That's cheaper than going to the movies," he said.



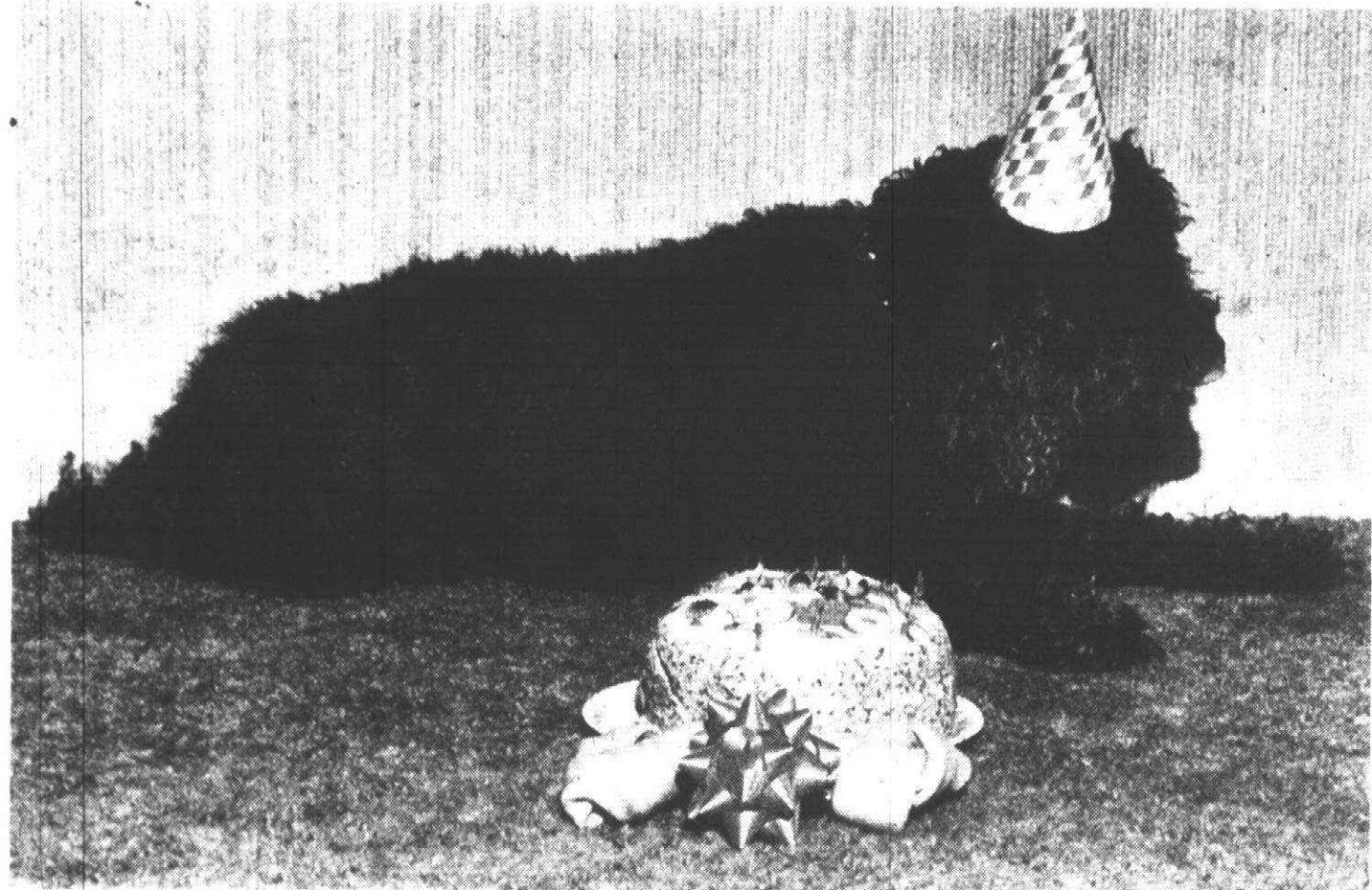

Remember the old song, "Love Makes the World Go Round"? Well it does more than that. Properly passed along, it allows dogs, especially poodles, to live to ripe old ages.

One of the best examples of what love and tender care can do is Peppy, a large black-haired poodle that is approaching his 21st birthday and is the pride and joy of the Owston family at 7320 Admiralty, Canton Township.

The Owstons and their three daughters—Susan, Cheryl and Debby—are planning an unusual birthday party and expect to have all the dogs in the neighborhood, some of whom are regarded as Peppy's "cousins," as guests.

"And we are going to have a big bone for Peppy," says Barbara Owston.

"He loves bones and when a dog reaches the age of 21 he's entitled to the best bone we can get."

WAYNE, WHO is employed at Detroit Metropolitan Airport, purchased the dog when he lived in Detroit with his family. As he tells it, "He has been like a brother to me all these years."

The Owstons think the dog is the oldest canine in the area, but even the veterinarians are not certain.

Dr. Richard Smith, a Plymouth Township veterinarian, said it is one of the oldest he has ever heard about.

"When you figure that one year of a dog's life is equal to seven of a human being," he said, "then you can realize that the Owston dog is 147 years old. And that is most unusual."

Dr. Richard Kirchgatter of the Canton Veterinary Clinic has treated Peppy from time to time. He claims it is one of the oldest dogs he ever has heard about.

"While he has the usual ailments that come with old age, Peppy has an unusually strong heart. And that is what keeps him going."

But the Owstons attributed Peppy's old age to something else.

"Tender, loving care," Mrs. Owston said. "He's always been treated like one of us."

"In return he has given us plenty of entertainment. You see, among other things, Peppy is a born actor. He walks sideways and at a 45 degree angle when he starts his show. And once in a while he plays dead. He'll curl up and then lie still on the floor. When we attempt to pick him up he

soon jumps up and comes to life. But he's a real actor."

PEPPY IS unusual for more reasons than his age. Despite the loving care he gets from everyone in the family, he is partial to Wayne and Cheryl, the tallest of the girls.

"He's at his best when he acts as the judge of the girls' boy friends," Mrs. Owston smiled. "No sooner do they arrive than he inspects them and then we can tell by his actions which of them merits his approval. Yes, he's quite an actor."

"Another thing," Owston pointed out, "is that Peppy is peculiar about travelling. Ordinary dogs don't like to leave home, but he just loves to visit my parents in Sterling Heights. And he lets us know when he would like to make the trip. Talk about a brother. He's just like one."

There is only one thing that bothers the family and its relations with the dog.

"The only joy he missed in life," Mrs. Owston confided, "is that he never has had the joy of being the father of a litter of puppies. He takes his job in life by being a pal and pet to all of us, especially Wayne who bought him when he was 8 weeks old."

## 3d bike day is set for Sept. 9 on Hines

Summer isn't over, but: You'll want to circle Saturday, Sept. 9, on your calendar. The third bike day of the year will draw thousands of two-wheelers and many hikers to the Hines Parkway in western Wayne County.

From 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., no motor vehicles will be allowed on an 11 1/2-mile stretch of the Hines from Ford Road in Dearborn to Haggerty Road in Plymouth Township.

The Wayne County Road Commission notes that parking will be prohibited in the park, so it's suggested you ride your bike to the scene. Refreshments can be obtained along the route. Pedestrian and rider picnics also will abound.

And if you're the type who likes to plan way, way in advance, the fourth and final bike day will be Oct. 14.

WALLEYE FISHING is almost the only kind of game fishing that's attracting any attention these hot August days.

DNR officers report walleye anglers are doing well off shore from Sterling State Park down Monroe way. Good to

excellent walleye fishing is reported in the St. Clair River and Harsen's Island channels.

Most are being taken during the day by chugging with minnows and worms or drifting with a crawler harness.

Muskie, northern pike and bass fishing reports are generally on the fair to poor side.

For those of us who aren't too snobbish about the scrappy little bluegill, now's the time to take them. Fish deep, on the edge of a dropoff, early in the morning or just before sunset.

Crickets are the August bait for 'gills, but they're harder and harder to find commercially. Bait dealers are having trouble getting them, and the cost is up.

On the western side of the state, old-timers used to use a caterpillar-ish creature called a catalpa worm—a green critter that you had to cut in half and turn inside-out. It sounds, and was, gruesome, but the 'gills sure loved 'em.

POORLY maintained septic tanks and use of lawn fertilizers.

That can be the formula for our trouble in northern Michigan inland lakes, according to the University of

Michigan's biological station at Pellston.

Folks want cottages, and they want nice lawns. They also don't like what they call "swamps" but which biologists call "wetlands."

The U-M operates Project CLEAR, which stands for Community Lake Environment Awareness and Research. It's trying to tell folks how to maintain their septic systems, not selling the idea of regional sewers.

Especially interesting is their pamphlet on Lakeland Reports, which describes the role of wetlands.

Lakes and streams are protected by those wetlands. Their vegetation removes sediment and damaging nutrients from the water flow. Wetlands provide temporary water storage basins, a protection against floods after storms.

And wetlands are breeding grounds for ducks and many species of food for fish.

The idea that you can build a bunch of summer homes around a lake, each with a sand beach, each with a manicured lawn—well, nature doesn't work that way.

## The Stroller

An onion-orange snack?

Although you won't find it listed with the special events on your favorite calendar, the papers carried an item the other day saying this is national sandwich month.

The Stroller sat there reading it while enjoying his eye-opening cup of coffee and learning that it was the Earl of Sandwich who started the fad of separating two slices of bread with a combination of your choice. Some of the many sandwich combinations that he had seen—and even helped to prepare—along life's journey came to mind.

It just so happens that The Stroller was helping to prepare sandwiches long before the hamburger was ever heard of, when no one believed that anything could ever supplant the hot dog.

In those days when The Stroller was a lad in knee britches, his parents operated a lunch counter. It was a small place with only six stools, a counter and a three-burner gas stove. And he recalls the day they purchased their first coffee percolator. It was a fancy affair and made six cups of the brew. Folks used to order coffee just to watch this silver attraction percolate.

The fad then was the hot dog. At first it was the frankfurter placed between two pieces of bread. Then came the fad of spreading mustard from one end to the other. In fact the mustard became so popular that The Stroller's dad was seriously thinking of charging for it. He never did tack on the charge, but the mustard bill sure cut into the profits.

LIKE IN ANY SMALL town, the various businessmen liked to support each other. So there was scarcely a day when the owner of the old butcher shop didn't drop in and have his hot dog.

To return the favor, The Stroller's dad used to visit the butcher and purchase ground meat—sometimes several pounds. He would take some of it home for us youngsters. But he always kept some at the shop for himself.

Eventually my father got tired of looking at hot dogs. For his dinner, he began taking a handful of ground meat and make a patty of it. He then would fry it.

One evening, a customer came in and Dad hurriedly placed the hamburger patty between two slices of bread and ate it. The customer spotted it. He wanted a duplicate. Soon the ground steak between two slices of bread became popular. Could that have been the start of the hamburger fad that has swept the country for years?

Among our many customers was a fellow who always wanted to be different. He asked for a slice of Spanish onion to be placed over the ground steak. This was something different. Soon others followed. Then one night he asked that the onion be diced, pressed in to the patty and then fried. Now this was a tasty dish. To this day this is The Stroller's favorite hamburger.

The combination of hamburger and onion wasn't the only thing this unusual customer started. During the winter when oysters were in season, there was seldom a night that he didn't order oyster stew. This was common, for most of the men used to enjoy a stew after coming downtown to get the baseball scores (this was before the days of radio).

FOR A LONG TIME no one paid much attention to him, but he had a most unusual taste. He wasn't satisfied with the oyster stew until he poured almost a half bottle of catsup in to it. Bystanders would look and then shake their heads. How could anyone enjoy an oyster stew that was half catsup?

But that was not all. The big surprise and shock came one evening when The Stroller's mother was behind the counter. She had baked several pies that afternoon and mentioned to this unusual customer that she had some great Dutch apple pie awaiting him. He took it. And would you believe it, he poured catsup all over the top crust. Mother turned her back and brushed away a tear. She just couldn't stand the sight of catsup on her favorite pie.

But the biggest shock was still to come. One evening, after looking over the baseball scores, he ordered an egg sandwich on toast and asked that a slice of Spanish onion be placed over the fried egg. Unusual? It was in those days.

Our most unusual customer then reached the epitome of unusual sandwiches. When he took a seat at the counter, The Stroller's Dad was ready to prepare the egg and onion sandwich. But the customer halted him.

He said he wanted something different. He didn't want a hot sandwich. This time he ordered toast with a slice of orange and placed the Spanish onion, about one quarter inch thick, over the orange.

Something different? It sure was. If you don't think so, just try it sometime.

It isn't a bad combination. It may be good enough to enter in a sandwich contest. But don't say The Stroller told you.

## Hellenic hustle

### It's not a dance, but Greektown shakes with activity day and night

Greektown is a Mediterranean gem in a Detroit setting.

By day the sun casts a bright spell on both sides of the street, with its narrow sidewalks and colorful storefronts. Gift and souvenir shops, groceries and bakeries, restaurants and cafes lure city dwellers, downtown-area workers, tourists and suburbanites to Monroe Street, just west of I-75.

At night, neon signs beckon visitors to enter and enjoy the activities of this small, thriving community. The Greek heritage that has been retained makes Monroe a magnet in Detroit's downtown.

Greektown, one block from police headquarters on Beaubien, is always well-policed by officers who enjoy the vibrant street.

**YOU CAN TAKE** in Greektown at a glance by standing on the corner, facing Beaubien and Monroe. On the right, the first thing you see is a blue and white sign showing a Grecian facade and telling you that this is Greektown.

On the left side of the street, you can enter Delmar Foods of the World through its three-dimensional Grecian facade topped by a turquoise awning that reads "Grecian Boutique."

Inside, women shoppers browse at the souvenir jewelry counter and import clothing boutique. Greek fisherman hats of denim and braid are on sale for \$10.

At lunchtime, during the week, you can select your own Greek bread or fat rolls in the grocery section and have a sandwich made to order; meanwhile, you can eye the cheese, olives and other Greek specialties in the meat-market cases.

Back on the street, you can continue your journey down both sides, coming closer to the spires of St. Mary's Church across Monroe. In the church, noontime worshippers slip into the pews, and a jingling breaks the silence when a young mother comes in with her daughter, whose baby shoes have bells on them.

**AT NOONTIME** during the week, Greektown is jammed with people hurrying into such favorite restaurants as the Grecian Gardens or New Hellas Cafe, to enjoy shishkebab, souvlaki and many other Greek dishes.

Food in Greektown is plentiful and inexpensive. A meal usually begins with thick slices of Greek bread. There may be Greek wine, including retsina with a resin taste, to enhance the food. A Greek salad arrives overflowing with piquant flavors; lamb, with okra or other vegetables, is juicy and tasty.

On the sidewalk, old men and other visitors rest sitting on wood and concrete benches. You may meet a panhandler. Cars pull quickly in and out of the full-up parking-meter spaces at the curb.

Many of the signs in Greektown are in both Greek and English, lending a feeling of authenticity to the street. Most buildings, in a cooperative merchant effort, are a pinkish-red brick, and awnings are in blue, red and white.

Curious pigeons peck curbside on the sidewalk and sparrows nibble in the street.

**AT LUNCH TIME**, Stemma Cafe overflows with customers, many of them businessmen, who walk away carrying small, string-tied white boxes, presumably taking baklava or other Greek pastries home for dinner.

Uniformed police officers, military servicemen and women abound in Greektown, among the many interesting people you will see here.

In the bareness of the Peloponnesos Cafe, men play pool or drink at tables, and at the Macedonia Club, pinball machines are in operation. Other businesses, such as the Litos Agency (travel service), Atlantis News Agency (imported cigarettes, Greek

records) and Athens (books, music gifts, printing) offer assorted wares to those who step inside.

Trapper's Alley, an historic old building that has been renovated, houses boutiques selling plants, clothes (T-shirts that say "I Love Greek Town, Greek Town Loves Me"), antiques and collectibles, candles, paintings, books and pottery. Paintings are exhibited in an alley court.

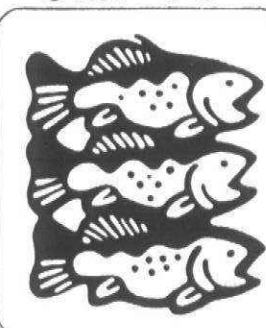
Nighttime in Greektown throbs with food, music and entertainment. The gutsy Attic Theatre at Trappers Alley, which has received critical acclaim, just opened with "The Shadow Box," a 1977 Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award winner.

# Plymouth all-stars take 3 of 4 from Canton

The Plymouth all-stars took three of four games from their Canton opponents at the second-annual slow-pitch softball event at Massey Field Friday night.

Plymouth won the men's 'A', men's 'C' and women's all-star games, while Canton managed to capture the men's 'B' contest.

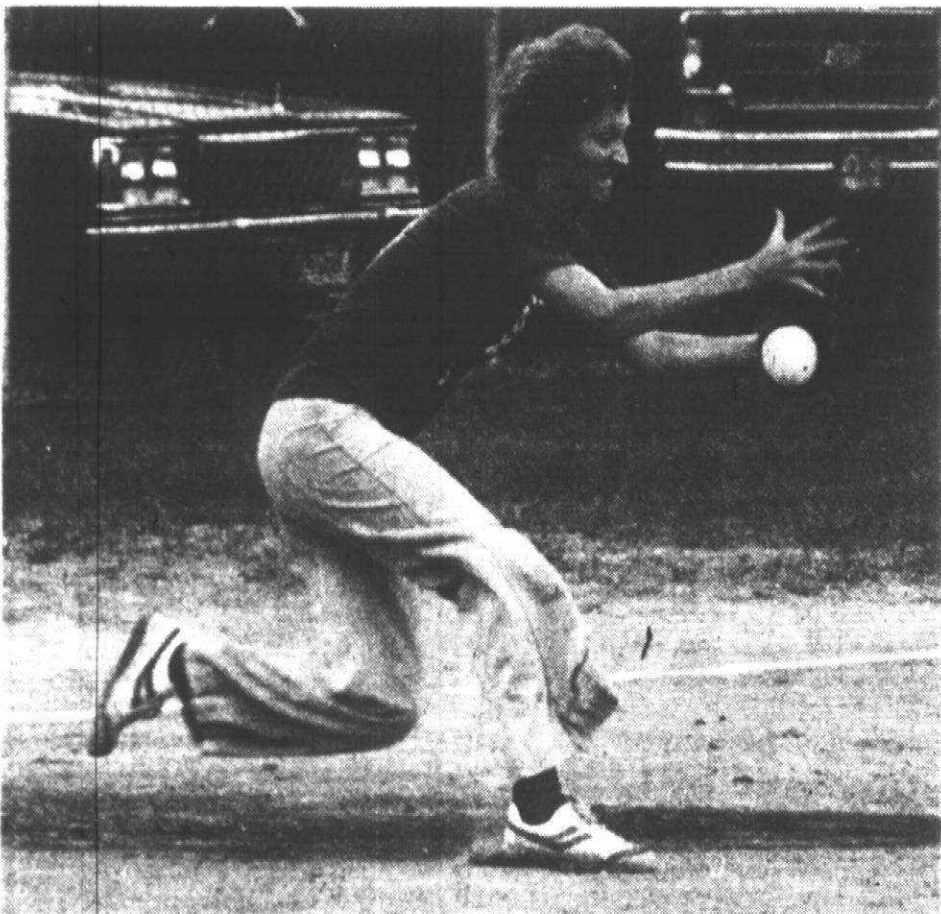

## Tennis lessons offer skill training for kids

Both men have taught privately in the past but decided to try group instruction this summer through the continuing education offices.

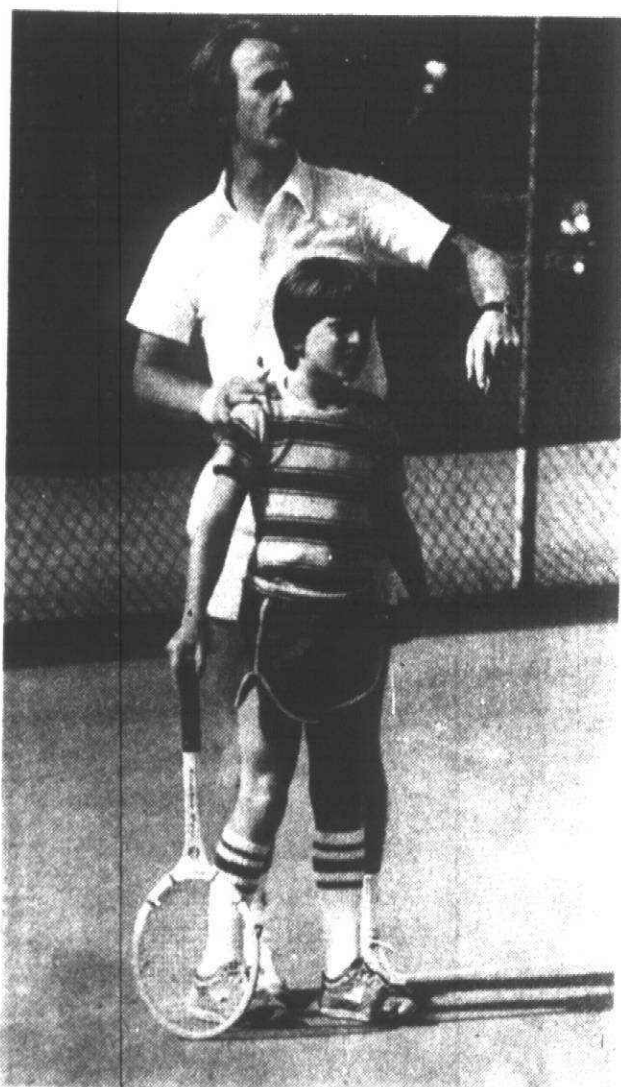
As in any teaching or learning experience, it has its good and bad times. Both instructors admit, however, it has been a rewarding experience to see young beginners develop tennis skills and interest.

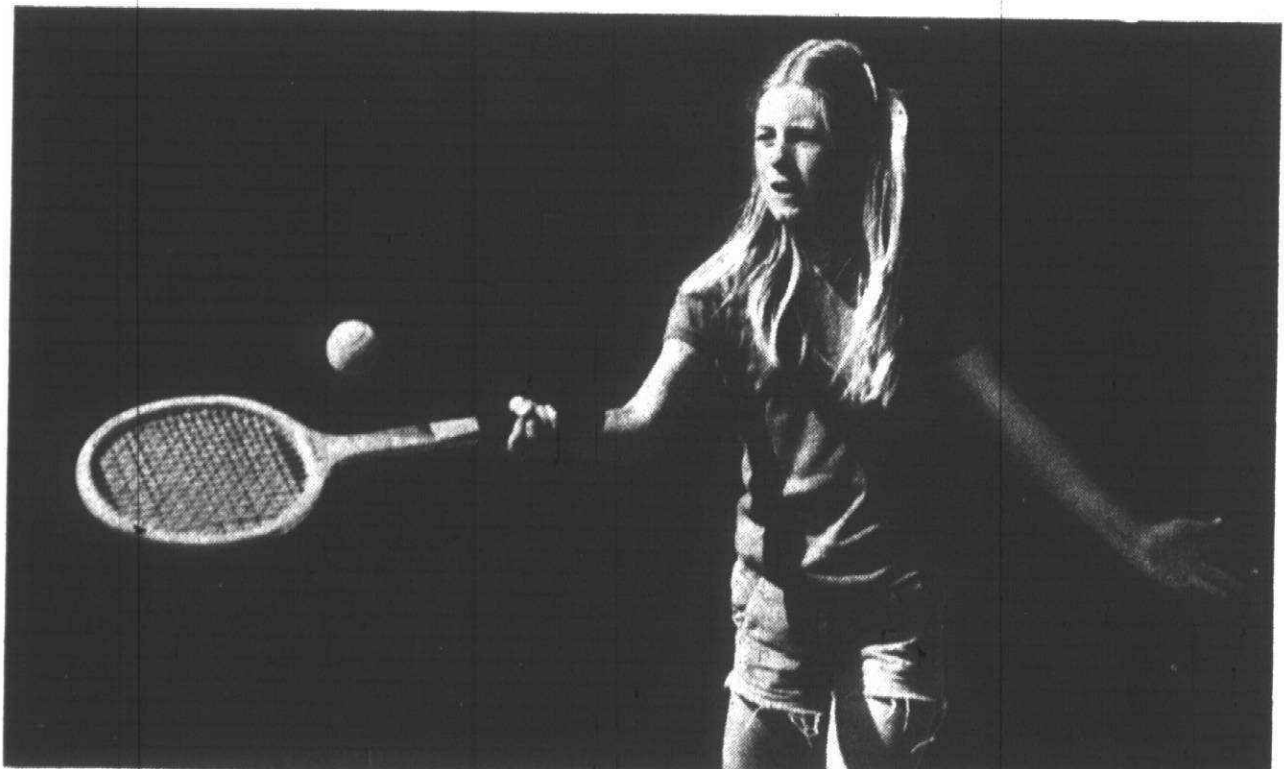
"We have beginners classes all day, and when I play here at night I see some of these same kids coming out to play after their classes because they are interested," Schultz said.

Tom Williams takes time out to give a tennis pointer to 11-year-old David Gladstein. (Staff photo by Gary Caskey)

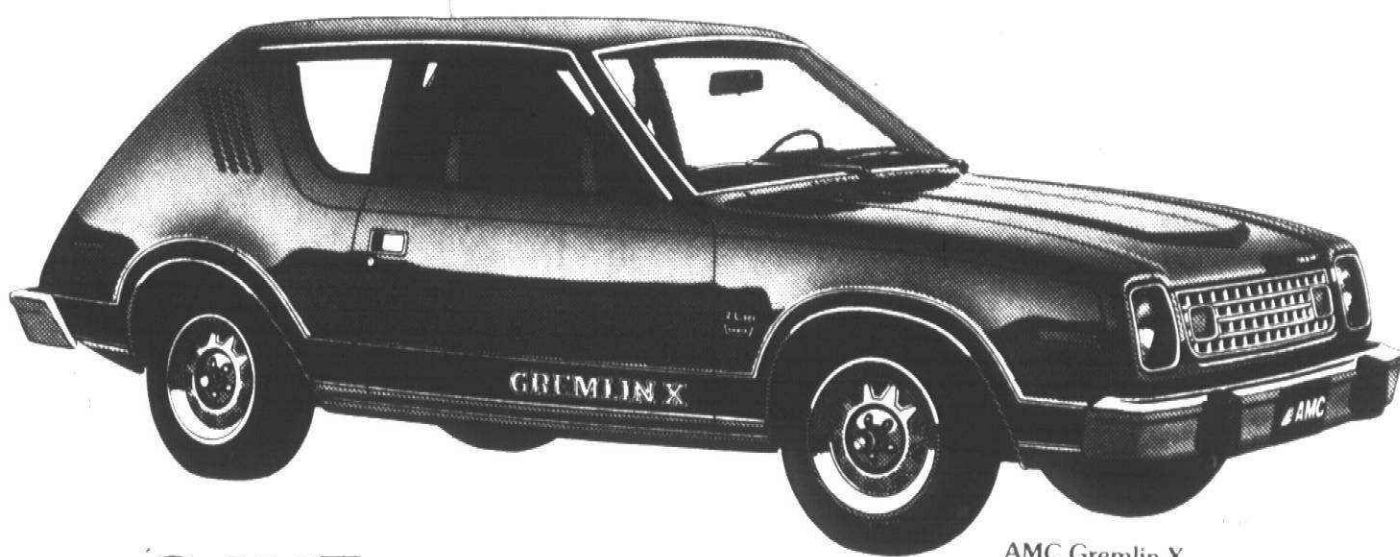


Middle School. LaChapelle is in the beginner's class. (Staff photo)

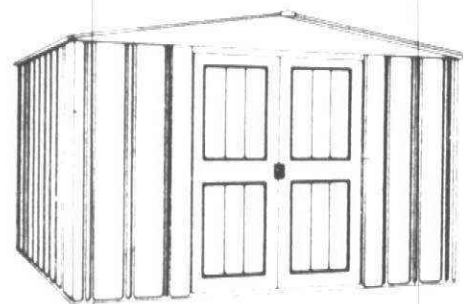

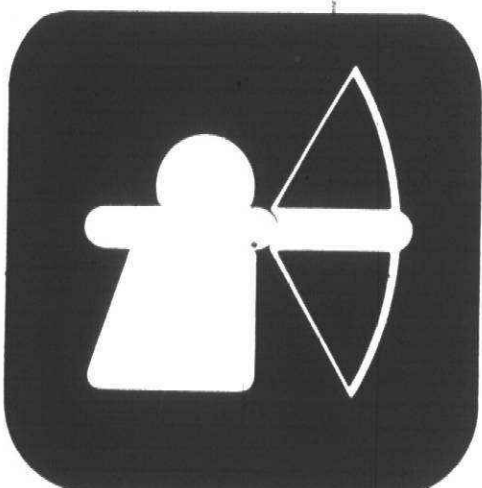

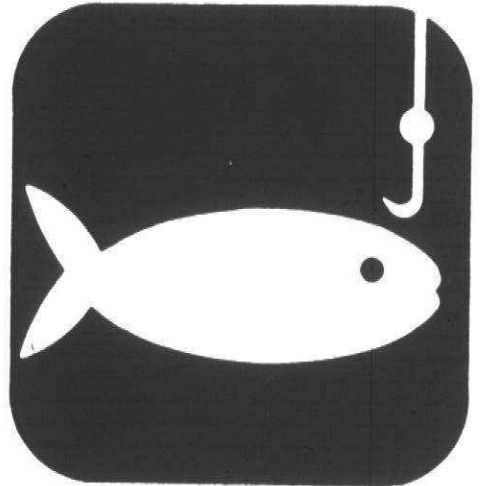

## Dawson gets mentioned

Phil Sahara's face is reddened from spending summer days outside watching baseball games.

His prized possession is a bleacher seat pad.

"It stops splinters and saves pants from wearing out," he explained.

For 18 years, Sahara has been scouting Michigan high school and youth baseball leagues for the Los Angeles Dodgers.

During most of spring and summer he'll watch two games each day. Right now, with post-season tournaments going on, Sahara and other pro scouts try to watch four games per day.

He was watching the Birmingham Lynch and Sons team win the Connie Mack District Tournament in Pontiac last week.

"I have to kick Floyd (Lasser, the Lynch team manager) to get rosters," Sahara said. "He comes to a game with one roster. I said, 'Great. Now give me a knife and I'll cut it up between the five of us scouts.'"

Sahara had added some information to his roster, including each player's position, school, year in school, batting order and which hand each player throws and bats with.

"WHAT WE'RE LOOKING for now is someone who has another year of high school," Sahara said, "and we'll put a follow on him."

"Here's a player," Sahara explained, "Scott Dawson, first base. He has another year at Canton High School and he also pitches. I am going to put a follow on him."

A "follow" means Sahara will write to Canton High School for next year's baseball schedule. Next spring Sahara will take another look at Dawson.

There were some other players on the Birmingham Lynch and Sons team who impressed Sahara, but he refused to name any more players because he didn't want to point out his picks to other scouts.

Sahara has found some good talent for the Dodgers in Michigan. Top among his finds is Steve Garvey, who has gone on to be a most valuable player with the Dodgers.

Other Sahara finds are Ted Sizemore of the St. Louis Cardinals and Tom Paciorek, now with the Seattle Mariners.

From his roster, Sahara will rate each player on the teams he scouts. He grades prospects in four categories: arm (throwing); speed (running quickness); batting and fielding.

"Whenever a kid excels in one category it's a plus," Sahara said. "If the pluses outweigh the minuses, we put a follow on him. 'If a kid is outstanding and not fully developed we recommend him to a college and put a follow on him,' Sahara said. 'If we sign a kid too early and he gets cut, then he's ineligible for college baseball and ends up pumping gas.'"

A FORMER MINOR league player in the Dodger organization, Sahara is a retired Detroit police officer.

Even though the motels and restaurant food seem the same after awhile, Sahara said he loves every day.

"It's a thrill for me to sign someone and see him go on and make good," Sahara said.

However, this season has not been one of the best.

"This is a lean year," Sahara said. "It seems like kids get out of school and don't play as much, or not as much as I would like to see. It hurts me when I go by a ball diamond and no one is playing, then I know that kids are neglecting their national pastime."

Sahara said he was happy to see that Kirk Gibson, football and baseball player at Michigan State University, signed with the Tigers.

"I hate to lose good athletes to other sports," Sahara said. "Kids are going to see that they can make big money playing baseball."

Sahara claims the Dodgers broke the ice with Gibson.

"We were talking to him," Sahara said. "He said he liked baseball, but loved football. We pointed out that even if he hurt his knee, which is a freak accident in baseball, but commonplace in football, he could pinch hit or play first base."

"Then we asked him how much money it would take to get him to forget about football," Sahara said. "Off the top of his head he said \$100,000. When he was told that figure was not out of the question, his eyes lit up."

Sahara smiled as he recalled that story.

# Griffin shellacks Ann Arbor

It's on to Johnstown, Pa. tomorrow for Griffin Sport Shop, to compete for the All-American Amateur Baseball Association national championship.

Griffin qualified by steamrolling Ann Arbor last week in a best-of-three series, 16-2 and 13-5.

Griffin, first-place finisher this season in the Livonia Adray League and winner of the Adray League playoffs, is the first Livonia team ever to qualify for the AAABA finals.

The Livonia contingent, managed by Roger Frayer, rides an eight-game winning streak to Johnstown. Sixteen teams will duel in the two-game knockout tourney.

# White Castle burgers still thrive without frills

With jagged turrets suggesting medieval architecture run amuck, the White Castle's porcelain exterior is still the best advertisement for the hamburgers with the holes.

Unchanged since 1928, when the restaurant designed its buildings along the same lines as the Chicago water tower, the structures are an example of the company's attitude.

The folks at the Castle thrive on tradition.

While the market is flooded with breakfasts, cartoon-character-inspired food and lots of dressing on double deck hamburgers, the Castle has managed to survive by dishing up a modest-sized burger without frills.

With the exception of introducing frozen and dehydrated foods to the kitchen, the burger has remained the same since 1916, when Walter Anderson realized he had devised a different way to serve hamburgers and waited for the world to beat a path to his door.

Today, White Castles are scattered across the country, with the Detroit regional office in Farmington Hills.

**BUT THOSE GLEAMING** emporiums of burgers and fries would have remained stalled as roadside shacks if Anderson hadn't met real estate man E.W. (Billy) Ingram, who was to become the king of the Castles. Anderson sold out his share of the property in 1933, but Ingram kept on adding the turreted fast food restaurants to the American landscape. Today, his son, E. W. (Billy) Ingram Jr., continues the family tradition.

It's a plan that's seen some success. In the Detroit area last year, about 18 million of the burgers were consumed, according to Frank Silva, area manager.

Silva chalks up the number of sales to the White Castle code.

"We try to serve quality products and hire nice personnel," he explained.

The hamburger they serve up is essentially the same as the one Anderson flipped off the grill in 1916. The five holes in the patty are part of the White Castle scheme to make a quick sandwich. The holes allow for even cooking of the meat while relieving the cook of the task of flipping over the burger on the grill.

In fact, Silva adds, the burger never touches a White Castle grill. A layer of onions shields the patty from the grill's hot metal grids.

**THE BUN**, made at the company's own bakery, is placed over the patty to absorb the meat's juices. All the products are stored in a 30,000-square-foot warehouse in Farmington Hills.

As for competition, the Castle opts out on royal prerogative—the company says it isn't engaged in a commercial race over burger sales.

"We worried about competition years ago," said Silva. "Then we realized we weren't worrying about our own business. So now we're concentrating on business and not thinking about competition."

"We like to think we don't have competition. We serve a good product."

Like other fast food restaurants, the Castle has its share of customers and non-customers who refuse to leave.

"We discourage people from hanging around," said Silva. "But the new units have seating capacity and people like to hang around when they can sit down."

To combat this tendency, Castle workers try to encourage patrons to sit down, eat and leave. Families are encouraged to visit the Castle without making it their home.

Employees are usually too busy to chat with the customers, Silva adds.

"Our operators don't have time to encourage them by talking continually," Silva said of loiterers.

**NEW CASTLES**, like the one in Canton not only are equipped with a dining area but have full basements as well, containing washers and dryers for uniforms.

That's a far cry from the early days of the company when the owners couldn't get long-term leases for the small amount of property their buildings needed.

To solve this little snag, the owners devised a portable castle. The last one in the Detroit area was moved to its present spot on Fort and White in Lincoln Park from Melvindale, several years ago.

Behind those now-stationary counters are employees who work 37½-hours a week at a starting salary of about \$2.75 an hour.

"That (salary) varies because I change it once or twice a year depending on the conditions of the year we're working in," said Silva.

The wage scale varies according to position but all employees get a chance to participate in the company's profit sharing program and benefits.

"Our overall packaging is based on loyalty," said Silva, who started flipping White Castle burgers 32 years ago. "People can work themselves up in this business."

With 11 burger palaces in the area to guard, Silva is eyeing Roseville as the next spot for a Castle.

Troy is another possible location, but Farmington will have to wait for its own set of porcelain turrets. There isn't a spot of land zoned large enough in the area to support a Castle.

## Doubling of price index by '90 projected if inflation continues

If the 1968-'78 cost of living increases march up into the future, the government's Consumer Price Index at the end of 1990 will reach about 400, double the present level, and it will double again to about 800 by the year 2001.

"This is not a forecast," says Ewan Clague, former longtime commissioner of labor statistics. "It is a projection to show where the economy is going unless steps are taken to control inflation, whatever may be the cost."

Clague illustrates his projections: Where a half-gallon of milk at retail now costs about 85 cents, it would advance to \$3.40 by 2001 under continuing inflation. An \$100 men's suit would sell for \$400.

**CLAGUE JOINED** Labor Secretary Ray Marshall recently in testimony before a Senate Committee on Aging, considering the implications of the new law raising the private sector retirement age to 70 and eliminating it altogether for federal employees.

Earlier, Health and Welfare Secretary Joseph Califano had raised the specter that private sector workers upon retiring may have their own pension obligations that may interfere with their ability to pay. The trend toward early retirement is another factor of concern in Congress because of its income implications.

Marshall said his department's first

major concern is ensuring that older Americans will have the option of continued employment. The department, accordingly, is working on policies to implement the new age discrimination act amendments, even though enforcement responsibility will be transferred to the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission on July 1, 1979.

Marshall is interested in more research on the option of flexible work arrangements for older workers.

**OLDER WORKERS** should have the chance to ease into retirement—to continue working at rewarding jobs on a part-time or part-year basis, if they prefer, said Marshall.

"Employers ideally should provide a full menu of options for the older employee: continued full-time work, regular part-time, temporary call-back and consulting relationships," he added.

Clague, in measuring inflation trends, reported that the outlook for higher productivity is "not very good." The average gain for 1967-77 was just two per cent a year, a substantial drop from the three per cent which prevailed from the Korean War to the outbreak in Vietnam.

Clague's view is that productivity in the private business sector will continue into the 1980s at the two per cent level, with the possibility of some further reduction.

Under such assumptions, the system of escalating old age retirement ben-

efits by the CPI contributes to further inflation by increasing consumer buying.

Early retirement, the Senate Aging Committee was told, also may be generating inflation. In 1976, about half of the eligible men and 56 per cent of the eligible women chose the early retirement route.

"AT INFLATION RATES of seven per cent or more," Clague notes, "the early retiree would get higher benefits after age 65 than the fellow worker who continued working until age 65 and then drew his benefits."

While the trend in private industry is in the direction of earlier retirement, one problem is that a worker retired from one firm or industry can work and earn wages without loss of the pension.

In the auto industry, such early pensions are now payable at age 50. But such early retirement in autos, steel and some other industries are subject to a requirement that the retiree is restrained from earning wages or salaries in any other industry.

The former BLS chief says there is little doubt that early retirement plans create a larger financial burden on industry than would be the case if their retirement ages corresponded to those of Social Security.

Clague advocates a more intensive study of the early retirement problem to find out what can be done to bring the situation under control.

## Investors eye earning ratios

The stock market once again has erupted in a powerful display of activity and strength. The Dow Jones industrial and transportation averages have established new recovery highs on trading volume that has exceeded all previous records.

All of this has come in face of negative fundamentals.

Interest rates have continued to increase, inflation is approaching a double digit level, and the dollar continues weak against most foreign currencies.

Many market analysts are viewing this current phase of activity with skepticism. They argue that present economic conditions don't offer the background for a strong, sustained stock market rally.

But the fact remains that the market, as measured by the Dow Jones industrial average, has gained almost 20 per cent since the low point in April.

**WHILE THE NEGATIVES** are quite obvious to all who observe, what are the unseen positives that are causing demand to outweigh supply?

Probably the strongest argument for the market is the fact that, on a comparative basis, stocks are cheap based on historical standards of evaluation concerning market price related to earnings per share.

The main consideration in determining the fair market value of a common share is its price relative to the earnings that are behind it.

If a corporation's total earnings break down to \$1 per share, and the stock is selling for \$10, then it is described as selling for 10 times earnings.

If, at the same time, another company is earning the same \$1 per share and its stock is selling for \$20, then it is said to be selling for 20 times earnings.

This equation (called the price-earnings ratio) can be easily determined by dividing the latest 12-month earnings by the current market price

of the stock. You will find it computed for you on the stock quotation page of many newspapers.

**FOLLOWING IS** A comparison of price-earning ratios as they existed in August 1968 compared to the present:

Dow Jones industrial average, 17 times earnings in 1968 and now 10 times earnings in 1978; Dow Jones transportation average, 18 times earnings and now 8; Burroughs, 50-15; Ford Motor Co., 19-3; General Motors, 15-6; IBM, 45-15.

Expressed in another way, these figures relate what investors were willing to pay for \$1 in earning power a decade ago compared to what they are willing to pay now.

The comparison is quite glaring!

## Rate increase for CP brings blast by Kelley

Attorney General Frank J. Kelley's reaction to the Public Service Commission's recent approval of a \$39.8 million rate hike for Consumers Power Co. is one of dismay and disappointment.

"Forty million sounds like a small amount compared to the \$164 million the company initially requested," Kelley said. "But coupled with the \$15.2 million interim rate, Consumers got a \$55 million increase."

"I think that is excessive in light of the utility's financial picture, which is the best in company history. I think the customers, not the utility, are overburdened."

Insisting that Consumers' rates should be cut rather than increased, Kelley said that the \$55 million hike is more than four times the increase recommended by Public Service Commission personnel.

"As a result of the commission's action, return on common equity for Consumers will increase from 12.75 per cent to 13.5 per cent," Kelley said.

"I don't believe the Public Service Commission should be guaranteeing that kind of excessive return to a monopoly like Consumers Power."

The attorney general said he will review the commission's decision before deciding whether or not he will appeal it in Circuit Court.

## Lewis appointed

Arthur Lewis, director of Wayne County's Office of Manpower, has been appointed to the board of directors of the National Association of Counties for 1978-79. He will represent the National Association of County Manpower Officials on the board which is the policy-making arm of NACO.

**KNOWING THE** fundamentals helps your child make better decisions today for even better living tomorrow. Here are some tips to get you started:

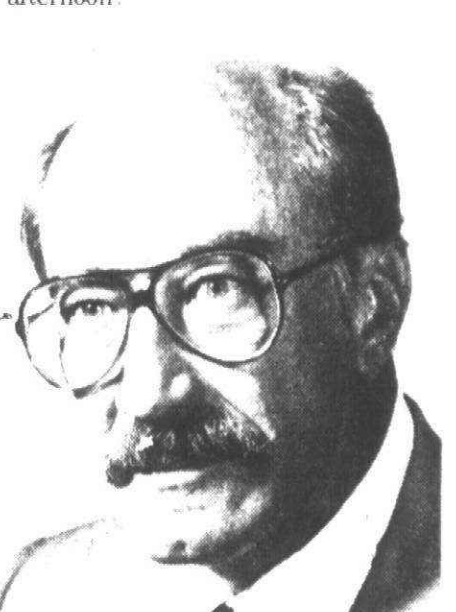
1. As soon as your child begins to retain what he or she hears and sees on television, talk about the worth of an item being promoted.

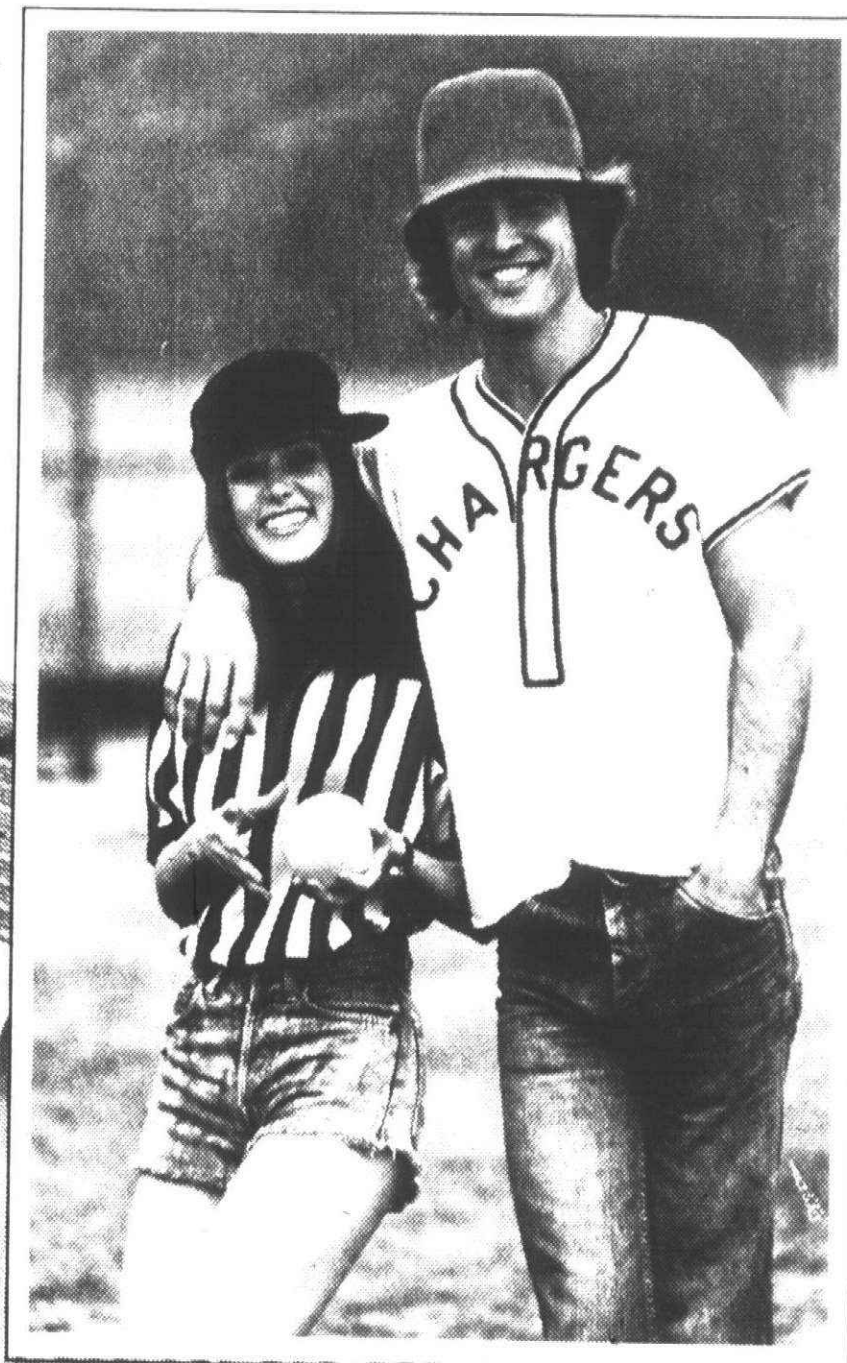

players. The six-week program takes place every July and August with classes held five days a week. A special afternoon beginners session for children on the year-round school program is also offered.

Williams and Schultz admit that it gets difficult at times with some beginners classes, simply because there are 20 to 30 kids on the courts at one time.

"It's awfully hard to individualize with the size that it is," Williams said. "When Curt and I work together, then we take some kids off to the side for a couple of minutes to help them."

Many drills are stressed in the class as the two

instructors teach the basic skills of the game. The beginners are also taught the proper way to keep score.

On the final week of the lessons, there is an informal tournament for all the kids where everyone plays in a double-elimination singles match to get gain competitive experience.

At the intermediate and advanced levels, drills and skills are still stresses but the emphasis is on improving on techniques already developed.

In the advanced class, competition is more prominent as the 23 players are also challenging each other in singles and doubles matches. Many of the advanced players competed in the recent Plymouth-Canton Tennis Tournament, while the

beginners played in the Plymouth Noyce Tennis Tourney. Both events were directed by Williams.

The instructors also invite other school systems with this type of tennis program to the Central courts for matches with the advanced players.

"I think Curt and I really stress to play competitively because it's a little different than just hitting the ball with friends," Williams said. "Plus the trophy (at tournaments) is an incentive—especially for the beginners."

Tennis, indeed, has become a popular sport in this community in recent years, and one of the reasons for this is the "grassroots" training offered by the summer tennis school.

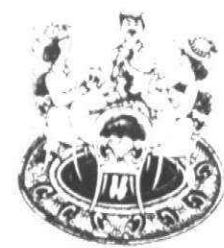

## Wendover's volley returned

Addressing Mr. Wendover's accusation that I have the characteristic of spouting off before researching the facts, Mr. Patrick Touhey, Observer reporter, can attest to my refusal to say certain things about the CCUS because I did not have the facts to back them up.

I resent the statements made by Mr. Wendover and the belittling tone of the letter, though this is not the first time he has treated me in such a manner.

As for the proposed survey, it is not the survey that is in question, but the time it is to be given. The survey should be given not before, but after

the public has been informed of the costs and feasibility of various unified services.

Of what benefit is it to give the survey based on present attitudes and services? Could it be the committee could use the area of greatest public dissatisfaction to spearhead their unification drive?

As for being "lost in Fantasy Land," it is Mr. Wendover et al who are lost. Mr. Wendover is so bent on consolidation (openly stated at the first meeting) that he is unable to objectively perceive and pursue the purpose of the committee.

Mr. Wendover wonders what my motives are for fictionalizing. This is no fiction, that is the sad part. The CCUS could have been a good fact-finding group for the residents of both the city and township. Now I wonder about any proposals that stem from that biased committee.

After his generous acts, Mr. Grace then explained that he and his wife wanted to go a step further to help out and he made a very, very substantial donation to the class of '80 fund.

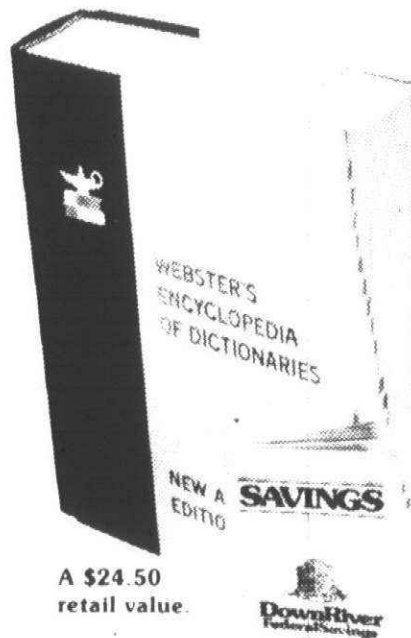

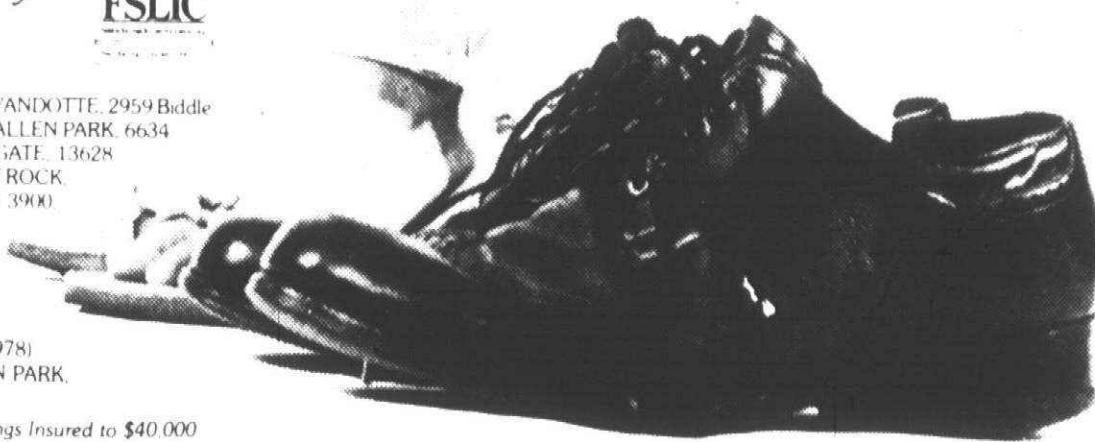

"Everybody thinks that for something to be good, you've got to add a bunch of stuff," he explained.

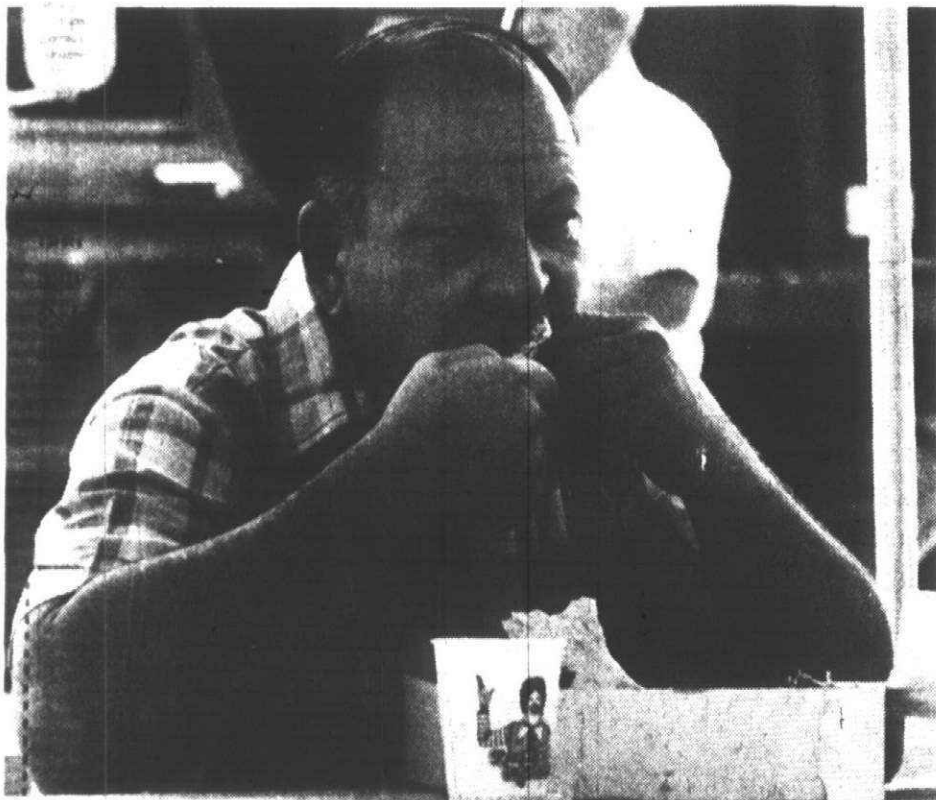
The corn, which came from Dick Palmer's Canton farm, also won praise from picnickers.

Prizes were donated by local merchants. John Crawford of Northville took home a 10-speed bike.

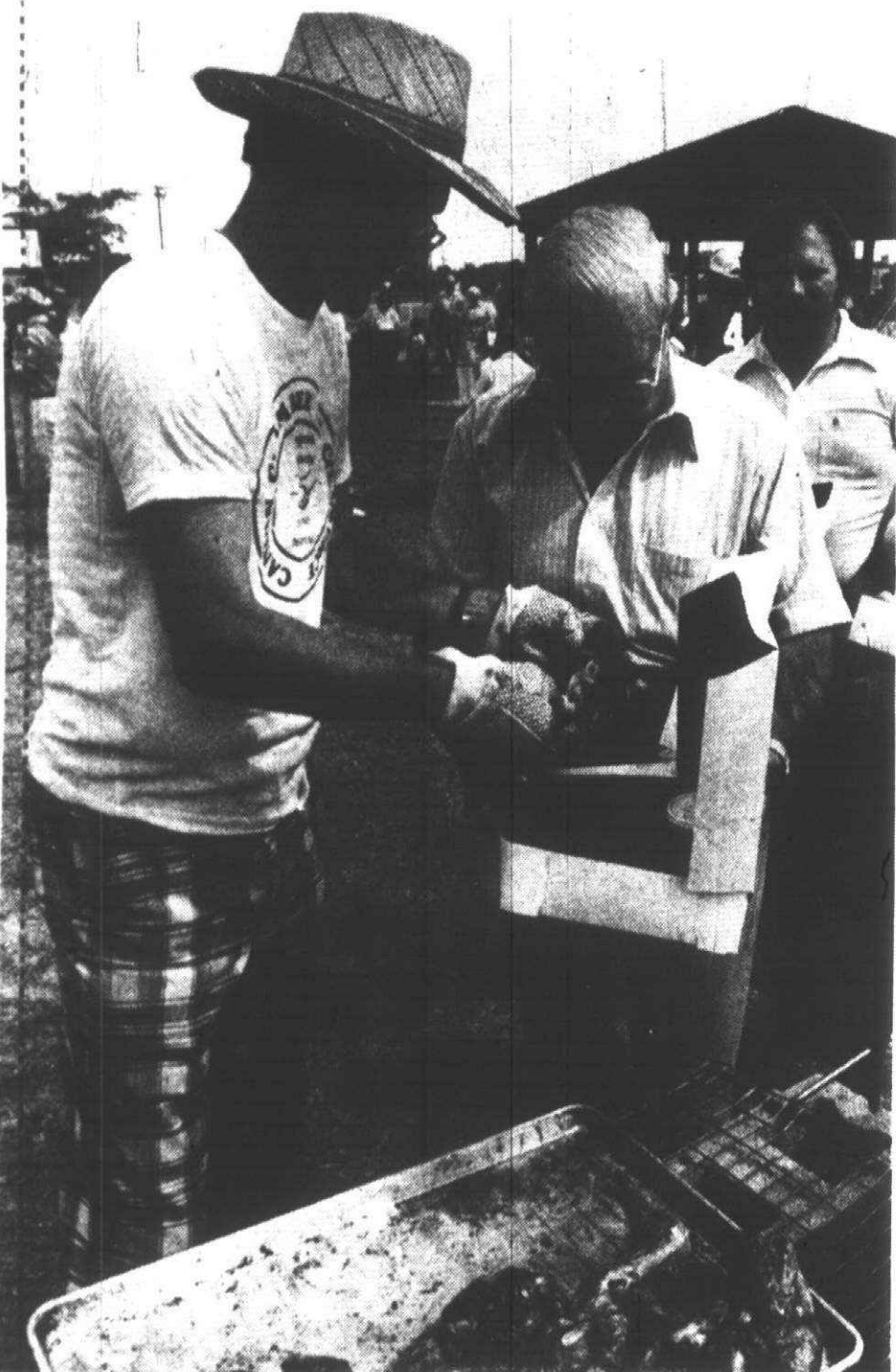

Laying in a hospital bed staring at a bouquet of straw flowers is possibly the last place in the world a person would be expected to get the inspiration for a business enterprise.

But that is the strange twist that came into the life of Joyce Crawford, the proud owner of a straw and paper flower business on Ford Road, known officially as Memory Flowers.

"I didn't pay too much attention to the bouquet when it was brought in to my bed in the hospital," she explained. "But as the hours and then the days wore on, I couldn't get it out of my mind. I grew to admire it."

As the years passed, she still remembered the bouquet, but the real inspiration came when her daughter asked her to make her bridal bouquet of crepe paper roses.

"It was a surprising request, though

I had been working on patterns and crepe paper to while away the time.

"You see," she said, "my daughter remembered the flowers I had been working on and she wanted something different for her wedding."

"When I hesitated she said, 'I'd be so proud to be able to tell my friends that my bridal bouquet was something my mother made.'"

Mrs. Crawford's eyes sparkled as she explained that single bouquet was the beginning of her business so aptly named, "Memory Flowers."

From that first wedding bouquet, the business has grown to the point where Mrs. Crawford has averaged at least one wedding a week since the start of the year. And it still is growing.

One of the facets of the business that has grown surprisingly is the unusual practice of placing bouquets and other floral under glass.

Young brides usually try to preserve their bouquets by drying them in scrap books or keeping them stored away in boxes.

Mrs. Crawford has gone one step better. She now places the bouquets framed under glass. The finished product has the appearance of an old-fashioned picture.

Wedding bouquets are not the only product of Mrs. Crawford's deft hands. She is now engaged in making all sorts of floral designs. Aside from the crepe paper flowers, much of the other material is gathered by walks through the wooded areas and often from the area around her former home in Sault Ste. Marie. Much of the baby's breath is gathered during her visits up there.

Mrs. Crawford and her family moved to Canton Township 20 years ago after spending the first 10 years of her married life in the Soo area.

Born a Detroit girl, she spent her early years in the metropolitan area. As she entered the work force, she became a member of the staff of the Detroit Shopping News. It was while on that staff she met her husband. After their marriage they moved to the north country.

## Museum guide offered

The 1978-79 edition of "Historical Museums in Michigan" has just been published by the Historical Society of Michigan in Ann Arbor. This second edition lists 144 museums, including 22 in the Upper Peninsula.

The 36-page visitors' guide is pocket-size and gives complete information obtained from each museum. Listings include the mailing address and telephone number of each museum, a description of the exhibits, the year-round schedule (including months and holidays closed), and all admission charges. Each entry includes the name and telephone number of a contact person for more information about group-sponsored tours and special arrangements.

Copies may be ordered for 50 cents each (40 cents in quantities of 10 or more) from the Historical Society of Michigan, 2117 Washtenaw Avenue, Ann Arbor 48104.

Michigan's historical museums cover a wide range of topics, from early pioneers and Indian cultures to industry, period furnishings, ethnic groups, skiing, musical instruments, and magic.

According to the Upper Peninsula entries, visitors can take a guided underground tour of the East Vulcan

Mine which operated between 1870 and 1945 at Iron Mountain. In Copper Harbor, the Fort Wilkins Historic Complex represents an excellent example of a frontier U.S. Army Post of 1844-70.

Artifacts from early missionaries are on display in Sault Ste. Marie's Tower of History/Shrine of the Missionaries. Great Lakes Indians exhibits are featured by museums from Marquette, St. Ignace, and Escanaba, as well as by Lower Peninsula museums from Petoskey to Niles.

The guide also reveals that railroad displays are popular among many museums, including Flint's Crossroads Village & Huckleberry Railroad. Here, one can visit a restored community of 16 buildings from 1860, and ride a rebuilt turn-of-the-century steam-powered railroad operating on a 9.5 mile track.

Michigan's ethnic heritage is reflected by such museums as Detroit's Afro-American Museum, which features 21 mounted African animal specimens. Dutch culture in the state is the focus of Holland's Netherlands Museum and Zeeland's Historical Museum. The Beaver Island Museum in St. James offers insights into an early Mormon community in Michigan.

## 'Foul Play' brings lovable characters together in danger

If there is such a thing as a movie with a winning personality, "Foul Play" (PG) has it.

First of all, the two principals are quite endearing. Goldie Hawn minus the squeaky-voiced, dumb-blonde image of "Laugh-In," creates a warm and sympathetic character as Gloria Mundy, Gloria, a librarian and recent divorcee, is the classic innocent thrust by circumstances into a world of intrigue and danger.

Chevy Chase, after a stumbling start, emerges cool and likeable as a San Francisco police lieutenant who is eager to comfort and protect her.

Secondly, the movie was written and directed by Colin Higgins who wrote the cult hit "Harold and Maude" and the successful "Silver Streak." "Foul Play," like "Silver Streak," belongs to that popular genre of movie, the romantic comedy-thriller ("Harold and Maude" is in a class by itself).

**THIRDLY, THE FILM** selectively borrows and builds on some of the most effective idioms of suspense and adventure. The melodramatic ending of "Foul Play," a race against time to stop a planned assassination at an opera house, vividly suggests the similar climactic ending in Alfred Hitchcock's "The Man Who Knew Too Much."

Although I do not know Higgins' thinking, I suspect that this kind of conscious borrowing is done in a spirit that salutes previous masters of the medium and also invites the audience to join in the fun that comes from recognition of movie experiences we've shared.

For example, Gloria, the librarian in jeopardy, is also a film buff. And in one comic sequence, we, the popcorn-chomping movie audience, watch Gloria sitting amid a popcorn-chomping movie audience watching Alan Ladd in a 40s melodrama, "This Gun for Hire."

Gloria's real-life situation is more imaginative and bizarre than any movie shewatches. She is less than effective, however, in convincing the police that her life is in danger, especially when she claims she's threatened by an albino and a dwarf.

When it's discovered that she was held captive in an apartment leased by a man named "Stiltskin," the police begin to take her seriously. The officer who takes her most seriously is Lieutenant Carlson (Chevy Chase) who likes her blue eyes.

**THE FILM DOES** not always move along smoothly and Chase's role is one of the reasons why. Initially, the humor is labored in a script which calls for him to be bumbling and klutzy. These characteristics disappear (all to the good) as the movie progresses and the comic episodes involving him depend more on repartee than slapstick.

Another hitch is Gloria's willingness to return to and enter her apartment, even when she finds the door unlocked and the memory of the last assault is still fresh. Higgins, I'm sure, has the talent to create a sense of danger without making his characters unbelievably naive.

These few deficiencies are overcome by the general excellence of the production and the performances. The supporting cast deserve honors for their distinguished characterizations: Burgess Meredith as a loyal and feisty landlord, Marilyn Sokol as Gloria's friend who is suspicious of all men, Rachel Roberts as a karate-chopping villainess, and Dudley Moore who steals numerous scenes as a symphony conductor with some kinky ideas.

## Michigan's full of old mills and bridges

### Excursions

The creaking sound of waterwheels and the echo of horses' hooves against hand-hewn timbers still can be heard in Michigan's mills and covered bridges, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

Products from livestock feed to tanga apple cider continue to be produced by mills scattered throughout lower Michigan while a few have been converted to other uses, including a theater and a restaurant.

Although more than a century old, some of the covered bridges listed by the auto club still carry light vehicles. Others have only recently been built as part of parks, picnic areas and resorts.

The tiny community of Ada near Grand Rapids is home of the 125-foot Ada Bridge, which in 1867 was the first to span the Thornapple River. It now is open to foot traffic only.

**VISITORS TO** Fallasburg Bridge Park north of Lowell will see a 100-foot structure built in 1871 across the Flat River.

And, just two miles north, a roadside table near White's Bridge is a favorite stop for picnickers and photography buffs. The 116-foot span was built with wooden pegs and hand-cut nails in 1869

and carries auto traffic across the Flat River.

At 282 feet, Langley Bridge on the St. Joseph River near Centerville is the state's longest covered span. Constructed in 1887, it, too can be driven by auto and seen from a nearby riverside park.

Those wishing to photograph the 46-year-old Morris Bridge, a 40-foot-long

structure on private property near Niles, must call (616-683-3329) a week in advance.

Five other bridges are of more recent construction. Newest is at Bay Valley Inn near Bay City. Until 1972, when sides and roof were installed, the 72-foot structure was a railroad bridge.

**ALPENA COUNTY'S** 60-foot-long Fletcher Park Bridge near Long Rapids was built in 1968 with hemlock timbers from the park's own groves.

Tourists can feed goats, deer and elephants and see other animals at King's Animaland near Richmond in southeast Michigan, where a 20-foot

covered bridge was built over the Salt River in 1965.

Reserved for golfers, the covered bridge on Detroit's Belle Isle Golf Course can be seen from the island's Oakwood Drive. The 70-foot span was built in 1913 of wood and concrete.

The only covered structure not original to Michigan is the 146-year-old Ackley Bridge in Dearborn's Greenfield Village (313-271-1620). Moved from Pennsylvania in 1937, it is used by the village's horse-drawn carriages as well as persons on foot.

The village also is home of what may be the oldest mill in America. The Cape Cod Windmill, moved there in 1936, was built in the early-to-mid 1600s and is one of a dozen mills on display.

**THE OLDEST** state business on its original site is Manchester's E. G. Mann & Sons Feed Mill (313-428-7007). Tours of this water-powered mill must be arranged in advance.

Holland's Windmill Island is the site of a 200-year-old Dutch windmill still grinding flour that visitors may purchase.

In fall, tanga apple cider is available for visitors to several water-driven mills. Two are in Rochester and Parshallville.

"We cooked the snake meat until it was very crisp so we could eat the bones," said Beth. "The pine needle tea gave us vitamin C." She described the flavor of snake as "something like fish and something like chicken."

She was one of 48 young women participating in Scouts on Survival (SOS) on Garden Island which is separated from Beaver Island by a mile stretch of cold, rough water with a swift-moving current.

There were six girls in Beth's group. The others had come from California, Texas, Ohio, Nevada and Indiana to take part in the SOS program designed by the Michigan Capitol Girl Scout Council of Lansing. Its purpose is to teach the skills of wilderness survival.

THE SCOUTS had undergone rigorous training before their six nights and seven days on the island. Their survival expert, Paul Risk, had insisted "survival is an attitude."

Although they were cold and hungry most of the time, none of them panicked.

"Of course, we knew they were going to pick us up," Beth said. After some consideration, she added, "I don't think I would panic if it were the real thing."

Preparation for their island venture began in East Lansing with Dr. Risk—three days of lectures followed by a day of practical experience at Rose Lake.

They ate tender young milkweed pods (boiled three times, then salted) and roasted grasshoppers.

They waded through a swamp and built shelters. An Air Force representative showed them how to build signal fires with white smoke for clear days and black smoke for cloudy days.

They learned how to set out flares, use signal mirrors and compasses. Their hunting skills included setting snare traps for small game and fishing with a thorn for a hook.

They could make their own rope by braiding the fibrous bark of trees. They learned about edible plant life.

THEIR EQUIPMENT was limited to a day pack, coffee can, fire starters, metal mirror, a small piece of steel wool, wire, fishing line and hook, Fels Naptha soap (for poison ivy), six band-aids and a tin cup.

Their wardrobe consisted of rain gear, jeans or shorts, wool pants, two pairs socks, hiking boots, T-shirt, two shirts, wool shirt, wool hat or cap and cotton work gloves. Around their necks, they wore a whistle, metal match, compass and dogtag.

There were no sleeping bags but each had a space blanket—shiny silver foil on one side and plastic on the other.

"There is no warmth in them, even when you wrap yourself up in one," said Beth. "They are strictly for shelter and the shiny side is supposed to reflect heat."

Training over, the group left Lansing at 3:30 a.m. on the two-hour drive to Charlevoix. Breakfast was limited to one slice of bread because of the 2 1/2-hour trip on the ferry to Beaver Island. A fishing boat delivered them to Garden Island.

"There wasn't room for all of us so the fishing boat had to make two trips. It was windy, cloudy and cold. It was rough going to the island."

The 48 girls were divided into groups of six and each group was led to a campsite remote from the others.

"IT WAS A TWO-HOUR hike to our spot on the southern shore. It did not take us long to discover another camp not too far away."

They were given flares, a map of the island, and a candy bar to be kept for an emergency if someone had to walk out for help.

Beth's camp was on a rocky shore. Their first shelter was unsatisfactory so they built another the next day, shingling the top with layers of ferns. There was a severe thunderstorm that night, but their shelter was dry.

Night temperatures were in the 30s and 40s so they tried to keep the fires going night and day.

They set 15 traps and checked them twice a day.

"Only one of the 48 girls caught a rabbit in a trap while we were there," said Beth.

"We tried to catch a sea gull one day. The water was so cold that we couldn't go fishing. We'd use up more energy catching it than the fish would provide when we ate it. We ate thistle flowers, bull rushes—the part underwater toward the roots—violet leaves, wild raspberries, bramble and black berries. One day we had crawdads, just a handful."

"We gathered wild rice and worked about three hours collecting half a cup. So, we ate mostly snakes. They were all over the place. We drank a lot of water and tried not to think about being hungry."

"We slept on the beach for a couple of hours in the afternoon. I found a lawn chair by the water. It was so comfortable after sleeping on all those rocks."

BETH SAID that at one time there were farmers on the island. Now all that is left is the ruins of their houses. The only regular resident is an Indian woman who moves into one of the old houses for the summer. Boaters sometimes stop at the island to picnic.

The time came when they decided they soon would be picked up. They had not been told when. They lit signal fires and made a 20-foot X out of their belongings on the beach.

Then they could, finally, discuss their hunger. "It was all we talked about. It was sunny and we waited and waited. We knew they were coming."

A Coast Guard helicopter flew over. It returned half an hour later and gently placed a package on the beach. It contained boxes of raisins, candy, soup mix and a note. They were to meet group 2 at 6 a.m.

"We all were revived when the helicopter came," laughed Beth.

There was one more night on Garden Island. They left the next day.

"We all got along well. There was never any friction. When we were hungry, we just slowed our pace. We couldn't run, but we could walk. And we laughed at everything—things that normally wouldn't seem funny."

What did she miss most while camping in the wilderness? "I guess it was my stereo, and my family," she said.

AS A MEMBER of Girl Scout troop 501, Beth traveled to Europe and visited Our Chalet in Switzerland when

she was a sophomore. Lorraine Hurtik was troop advisor at the time. The troop went spelunking in Kentucky caverns when she was a junior.

She missed the trip to Mexico this spring because she was in the hospital. Martha Bentley is now troop advisor.

Beth is the first Plymouth-Canton area girl scout to attend the SOS pro-

gram, now in its third year. She plans to keep up her membership even though she graduated from Plymouth Salem High School in June. She will attend Ferris State College in the fall and major in environmental health.

Someday, she may continue scouting as a leader.

an organization to help others share it. According to Mrs. Hahn, families are needed preferably with at least one teenager. She indicated students who will be arriving are between the ages of 15 and 19, and have all been exposed to English from the third grade up.

"It's a wonderful experience to have one of these students in your home," she said. "You form one-to-one relationships with them, learn to give and take and about how other people live." The students would be staying in a

home for one year and attending school with the host family's own children. They bring allowed their own spending money; the host family provides a place to stay and meals.

# Family trees are their business

Oley and Sandy Olson are tree fanatics, but the trees they fancy are not the kind trees that grow tall and give shade. The Olsons are genealogists who pour for hours over dusty records and ancient books to add roots, branches and leaves to their family trees. Now as managers of a store called Olson's Family Tree in Garden City, they are in a position to help others research their antecedents.

The store, at 33147 Ford, one block west of Venoy, is privately owned by members of the Church of Jesus Christ Latter Day Saints, and features books, records, tapes and jewelry of interest to those who follow the Mormon faith. In fact, it is the only retail store in Michigan that is Mormon-oriented, according to Mrs. Olson. It also is strong on materials of use to genealogists. Members of this church feel deeply about their ancestors. Most genealogists are aware of the enormous

repository of international records in Salt Lake City collected by the Mormon Church. "We are taught that a search for our ancestors is not just a hobby, but a linking up of families," said Mrs. Olson. "We believe in an eternal family." NINE YEARS AGO, the Olsons gathered up paper and pens and started their own research. "It gets into your blood, and you get hooked on it," said Mrs. Olson. "It's

like looking for lost children. You're not going to stop until you find them. You don't want to quit until you have put a whole family together. "We thoroughly enjoy it. We'll spend eight to nine hours in a county court house on a vacation searching for records while others are put on the beach. A fellow genealogist will understand that." In her opinion, many people want to start their own foraging expedition into the past, but don't know how. So they are afraid to start.

"We can help them learn to get going," she said waving toward the shelves of genealogy books and record keeping apparatus around her. "This is a place to find the forms a person might need to begin learning the basic joy of searching out one's roots. "We don't do the work for them. We just show them what is available for a beginner. Most people find the forms we carry useful for correlating family information. It's an organized way to keep research together."

## Prospects for jobs brighten

# Common sense saves gas

Few automobile owners know how to get the most mileage and performance from the gasoline they buy.

So the U.S. Department of Transportation offers these precautions you can take to improve performance and save gasoline.

First, to improve performance:

- Shop for a good mechanic. Check your friends and neighbors to see if they know one who is a specialist on your car.

- If you have your car serviced at a large agency, get acquainted with the service manager and see if you can have the same mechanic service your car every time.

- Be sure that a careful service record is kept on all repairs, so that the mechanic knows what work has been done before, and when.

- Follow the recommendations in your owner's manual for major and minor service and tuneups.

Further, to save gasoline and conserve energy:

- Check your tire pressure at least once every month, and check each tire, including the spare. Too low tire pressure increases rolling resistance, causes increased tire wear and reduces gasoline mileage.

- Periodically have your mechanic check the treadwear pattern of your tires to see if they are wearing evenly. If the front end is out of alignment, you will notice irregular treadwear. Mileage will also drop.

- If possible, avoid pressing your accelerator all the way down when climbing hills and long grades. It wastes gasoline.

- Avoid excessive high speed or jerky driving—learn to drive as smoothly and steadily as traffic and road conditions will allow.

- Turn off your engine if you stop more than a minute. Restarting uses less gasoline than a minute's idling.

- Use the brake rather than the accelerator to hold your car in place on a hill.

- Jumpy starts and fast getaways can burn more than 50 per cent more gasoline than normal acceleration.

- Avoid weaving, spurring and lane changing in heavy traffic. Such practices waste fuel.

- Look ahead and pace yourself to minimize stops at traffic lights and jam-ups.

- Slow down. Excessive speed is the greatest waster of gasoline. For best mileage, do not exceed 50 miles per hour.

- Limit the use of auto air conditioners and other fuel consuming accessories.

- If you get a sudden drop in gasoline mileage, check with your mechanic. Trouble is brewing, and the sooner you have it fixed, the less it is likely to cost you.

- Keep track of the miles per gallon of your car. This can help you learn better driving habits and spot trouble early.

- Before you buy a new car, ask the dealer how many miles per gallon you can expect. These figures are available for most models.

- Reduce the number of unessential auto trips through careful trip planning.

- Use mass transit, car pools or bicycles when feasible. And walk—shoeleather is cheaper than gasoline.

The 1978-79 edition of "Historical Museums in Michigan" has just been published by the Historical Society of Michigan in Ann Arbor. This second edition lists 144 museums, including 22 in the Upper Peninsula.

The 36-page visitors' guide is pocket-size and gives complete information obtained from each museum. Listings include the mailing address and telephone number of each museum, a description of the exhibits, the year-round schedule (including months and holidays closed), and all admission charges. Each entry includes the name and telephone number of a contact person for more information about group-sponsored tours and special arrangements.

Michigan's historical museums cover a wide range of topics, from early pioneers and Indian cultures to industry, period furnishings, ethnic groups, skiing, musical instruments, and magic.

According to the Upper Peninsula entries, visitors can take a guided underground tour of the East Vulcan

Mine which operated between 1870 and 1945 at Iron Mountain. In Copper Harbor, the Fort Wilkins Historic Complex represents an excellent example of a frontier U.S. Army Post of 1844-70.

Artifacts from early missionaries are on display in Sault Ste. Marie's Tower of History/Shrine of the Missionaries. Great Lakes Indians exhibits are featured by museums from Marquette, St. Ignace, and Escanaba, as well as by Lower Peninsula museums from Petoskey to Niles.

The guide also reveals that railroad displays are popular among many museums, including Flint's Crossroads Village & Huckleberry Railroad. Here, one can visit a restored community of 16 buildings from 1880, and ride a rebuilt turn-of-the-century steam-powered railroad operating on a 9.5 mile track.

Michigan's ethnic heritage is reflected by such museums as Detroit's Afro-American Museum, which features 21 mounted African animal specimens. Dutch culture in the state is the focus of Holland's Netherlands Museum and Zeeland's Historical Museum. The Beaver Island Museum in St. James offers insights into an early Mormon community in Michigan.
