Used copters called bargain

Canton Township may be in the used helicopter business soon, although not to the extent Supervisor Harold Stein would like.

The township board Tuesday approved the purchase of three used, government surplus helicopters for possible use by the police department.

Stein had urged board members to buy at least six of the aircraft, although he said that the township has no immediate plans to put any of them into operation.

According to Stein, the helicopters are a bargain and could be resold at a profit if the township fails to get federal subsidies to set up an air patrol.

The two-passenger helicopters are selling for \$500 each.

They are supposed to be in operable or near-operable condition.

Stein said the helicopters will cost a few hundred dollars each to transport and \$2,000 to restore to a value of about \$45,000.

Carol Bodenmiller, a member of the audience, asked the township board to turn down the purchase plan. She said she had done research revealing that the helicopters would be too expensive

to operate and maintain.

She contended that neighboring communities, such as Detroit and Warren, will offer the use of their copters in an emergency.

Stein took the position that it pays to be prepared, in case the township gets some kind of federal grant to support such a program.

Canton Police Chief Walter McGregor came to Stein's defense. McGregor said he had observed the performance of helicopter units in other police departments and thought they "give the city its money's worth and more."

"Whether it would work in Canton, I can't tell you, but I think it has an application, whether today or 20 years from now," McGregor said.

The lone trustee to vote against the purchase was Lynne Goldsmith.

The board stipulated that two agents for the township, one of them a helicopter expert, be sent to Arizona, where the helicopters are stored, to examine the 300 aircraft available and buy three in good condition.

Stein said the township can back out of the purchase if none of the helicopters are deemed fit.

Stein will run write-in effort to retain office

Canton Township Supervisor Harold Stein may be down, but he hopes not to be out.

Stein announced Monday that he plans to run a write-in campaign in another bid for the office of supervisor.

He lost the Democratic nomination by a wide margin to Noel Culbert in the August primary election.

He will face Culbert and Republican candidate John Longridge.

Stein's decision to defy his defeat in the primary was prompted by what he said are "unselfish reasons."

"I feel I've started a lot of positive programs. I don't think people had the facts during the primary."

Stein earlier denied that he would run a write-in campaign. But he said he has had "a lot of offers for help" on the campaign, and this accounts for the change of heart.

He says he doesn't know yet if some of the organizations, such as the UAW, which endorsed him for the primary, will continue that endorsement or "maintain a neutral position."

He has hopes that the general election will bring out more voters than the small turnout at the primary, which he claims was comprised of a large share of anti-Stein forces.

Stein's reversal on his position has raised the question whether Treasurer Anne Bradley, who also lost in the primary, will seek office again through a write-in campaign.

Mrs. Bradley, when contacted by the Observer, would not rule out the possibility of trying to hang on to her office in the general election.

She says she plans to make a decision by the end of this week. Her husband, George Bradley, is Stein's campaign manager for the write-in effort.

Township hall opens

The doors of Canton's new administration building on Canton Center near Proctor have officially opened to the public.

All township departments except the DPW and the police and fire departments moved to the new building last week.

The township board will continue holding meetings at the firehall at Canton Center and Cherry Hill through September, however.

Finishing touches are still needed to

complete the meeting hall in the new building. The township board is expected to hold its Oct. 3 meeting in the new facility.

The old township hall on Geddes near Michigan will be made into a police station. The township board's meeting hall in the fire station will be used as a courtroom for the 35th District Court.

According to finance director Mike Gorman, construction costs of the new building fell within budget.

Local revenues to plummet if Tisch amendment passes

If the Tisch tax cut proposal ends up on the ballot and is approved by voters in November, governmental units in the Plymouth-Canton area will lose more than \$10.5 million in revenue.

The \$10.5 million cut in school and municipal services is based on an analysis of the Tisch Amendment done by the Wayne County Corporation Counsel, headed by Aloysius J. Suchy of Northville.

The Suchy analysis shows the revenue loss, if Tisch Amendment becomes effective, as follows for the local school district, townships and city:

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, an income loss of more than \$8.7 million; Canton Township, a \$978,410 income loss; Plymouth Township, \$192,630; and the City of Plymouth, an income loss of \$689,040.

Schoolcraft Community College would lose revenue in excess of \$1.6 million and Wayne County Community College would lose more than \$1.2 million.

School districts in Wayne County would lose a combined income of more than \$209 million. The total loss for 10 townships in Wayne County would exceed \$3.4 million, and the tax loss for cities would be more than \$114 million.

Wayne County government itself, already nearing financial bankruptcy, would lose more than \$50 million in property tax revenue.

THE TISCH AMENDMENT is a California-type Proposition 13 proposal backed by Robert E. Tisch, Shiawassee County Drain Commissioner.

There still is some question about whether the Tisch Amendment has qualified to appear on the November ballot. But if it does appear before voters, and is approved, the proposal would do the following:

- Reduce property tax assessments from the present level of 50 per cent to 25 per cent of true cash value.
- Require the state legislature to

provide a system of equalization of assessed valuations which could not increase by more than 2.5 per cent in any one year.

- Prohibit the state from imposing an income tax greater than 5.6 per cent.
- Permit the legislature to provide that any public school district K-12

may collect a local income tax no greater than one per cent for a period of less than ten years if approved by voters.

- Prohibit the state from requiring any new program for local govern-

Can Canton live with Tisch?

Finance director Mike Gorman suspects that Canton Township will not be as hard hit as some municipalities if the Tisch Amendment is approved by Michigan voters Nov. 7.

According to an analysis by the Wayne County Corporation Counsel, Canton would lose \$978,410 in revenue if the proposal to roll back property assessments by 50 per cent is approved.

Gorman believes the township could recoup about \$650,000 of that lost

income by increasing the police and fire millages to a level that would completely support the two departments.

UNDER A TENTATIVE budget proposal, the township will use \$300,000 from the general fund to support the police department in 1979 and \$350,000 to support the fire department.

The general fund supplements money from the police and fire millages.

The township currently levies two mills (\$2 per \$1,000 assessed valuation) for police and 1 1/4 mills (\$1.25 per \$1,000 assessed valuation) for fire.

But according to Gorman, the township can legally hike both tax levies to 10 mills for operation and an unlimited amount for capital improvements without a vote of the people.

Gorman says he will propose an increase in the police and fire millages if the Tisch Amendment passes.

Money generated by a millage hike could only be used for the police and fire departments, however. The township would still show a revenue loss of about \$326,000 if voters approve the Tisch proposal and the police and fire tax rates are hiked.

Gorman has not completed the township's 1979 operating budget proposal and he said he has no idea where the money would be cut.

The township board must approve the general operating budget by Oct. 31—one week before the Tisch proposal appears on the ballot. If

A Saxton undertaking

Family traced 20 years pre-Pilgrims

Few persons have a more interesting hobby than Mrs. Dean Saxton and she is working at it most every minute since she and her husband took up residence on Coolidge in Plymouth several months ago.

Mrs. Saxton has taken up the task of tracing their family backgrounds and thus far has found that some of the family forefathers came to America as early as 1598—some 20 years before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth, Mass.

"They came from England and were on Dean's side in a family named Stark," she said, then added, "I can trace my family, on my father's side, to John and Priscilla Alden—and that's going back a long way."

MRS. SAXTON became interested in

genealogy when her mother, who was a professional photographer, flooded her with pictures of her youth and those of her husband.

"I had so many pictures I just didn't know what to do, so I started a series of books, (scrapbooks are not to be mentioned with Mrs. Saxton's work) and now I am preparing a complete family history for each of my four children."

Because of her outstanding work in tracing the family history, Mrs. Saxton has been honored by the Mayflower Society.

She was invited to join the Mayflower group after displaying her work at one of the society's meetings some years ago in Palm Beach, Fla.

Aside from her books, which she refers to as pictorial genealogy books, Mrs. Saxton has developed a most interesting chart which marks every

person in the long line of descendants. It is called a "fan chart."

On this chart, the main person (the one studying the family line) is located in the middle at the bottom of the chart. On the left is the father and the mother is on the right. Then the various families and generations are fanned out until every one is registered. For instance, she has what she calls seven lines on the Stark family on her husband's side. She hasn't missed anyone.

In telling of her forebears, she likes to recall that her grandfather on her mother's side was William Stocking, who then represented the Detroit Board of Commerce and often was referred to as Mr. Detroit. And her father was at one time editor of a paper called the Detroit News Tribune.

It was a grandfather, too, who pub-

lished a book entitled "The 50-year Battle for a Bone Dry Nation." The book, naturally, espoused prohibition.

IN HER TRACING of the family background through pictures she likes to show one of Fred Saxton, Dean's father, who was manager of the first feed store in Northville.

It was there that young Dean was introduced to the feed business and later took over the store. He not only ran the Northville store, but opened one in Redford and then came to Plymouth where it became the Saxton Garden Center.

Mrs. Saxton has been working on the pictorial history for more than a decade and now is busily engaged in preparing a book for each of her children.

She started by giving each of them—Mollie Carrie of Westland, Dean Frederick, Jr., of Tucson, Ariz., William Edward of Plymouth and Mrs. Margaret Elizabeth Dykstra of Hastings, Mich.—the pictorial covers of the book.

Now as she prepares the pages, she sends them on to complete the work while she retains the original.

Like any other senior citizens who research the family background, Mrs. Saxton goes one step further. She not only writes a continuing history, but makes them almost priceless possessions by adding the pictures.

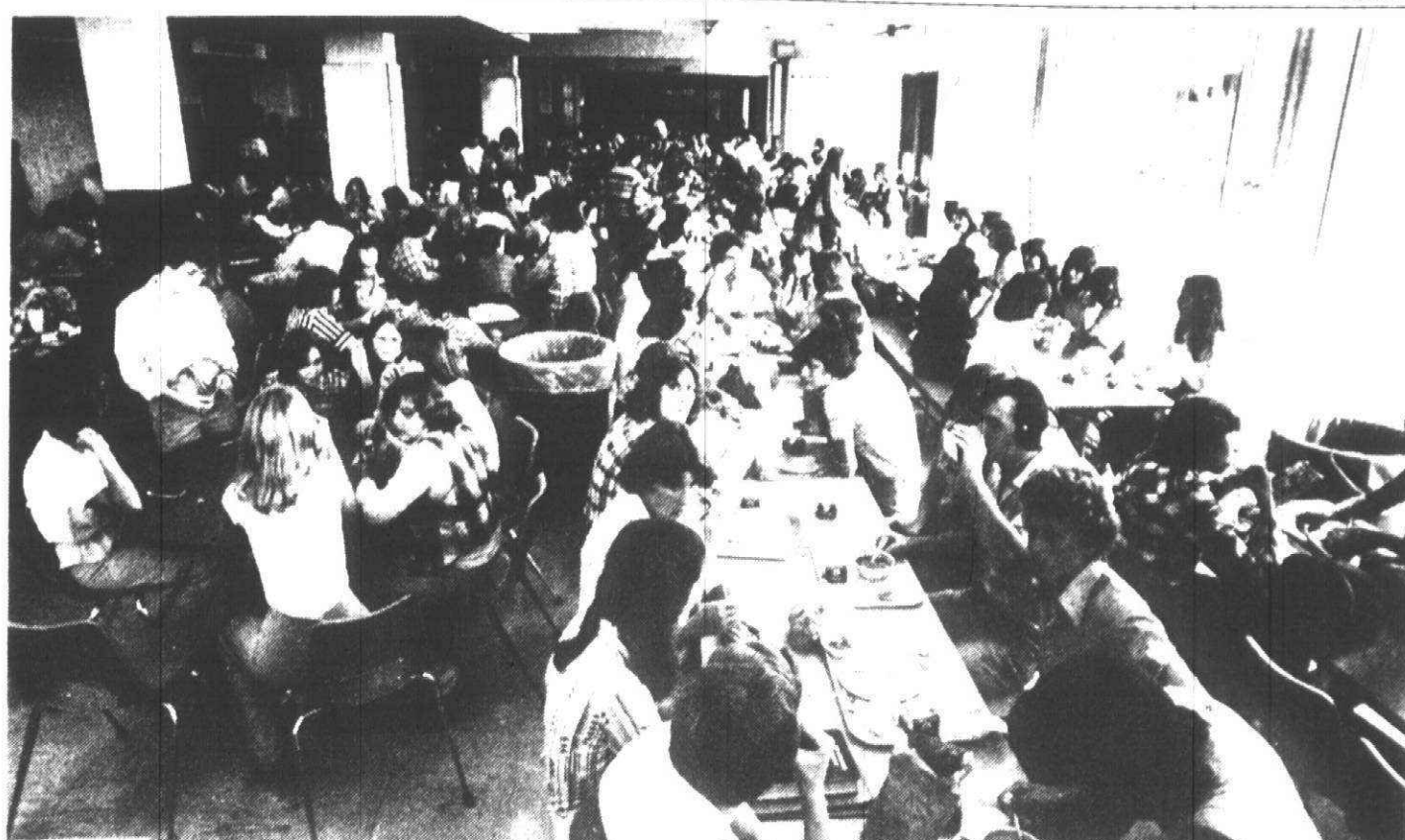

Smooth start at high schools despite switch

It was back to school for the throng of Plymouth and Canton youngsters who saw their summers come to a quick end last week.

At Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools, officials report one of the smoothest starts in several years. Compared to previous years, few students were seen wandering the halls and lined outside counselor offices confused over their class schedules.

The switch from modular to traditional scheduling, however, did create increased traffic both in the parking lot and in lunch lines but principals say the situation has been taken care of. It seems that traditional schedules require all students to start school at 7:15 a.m., causing traffic jams at both school and at the intersection of Joy and Canton Center Roads.

In past years, under modular sched-

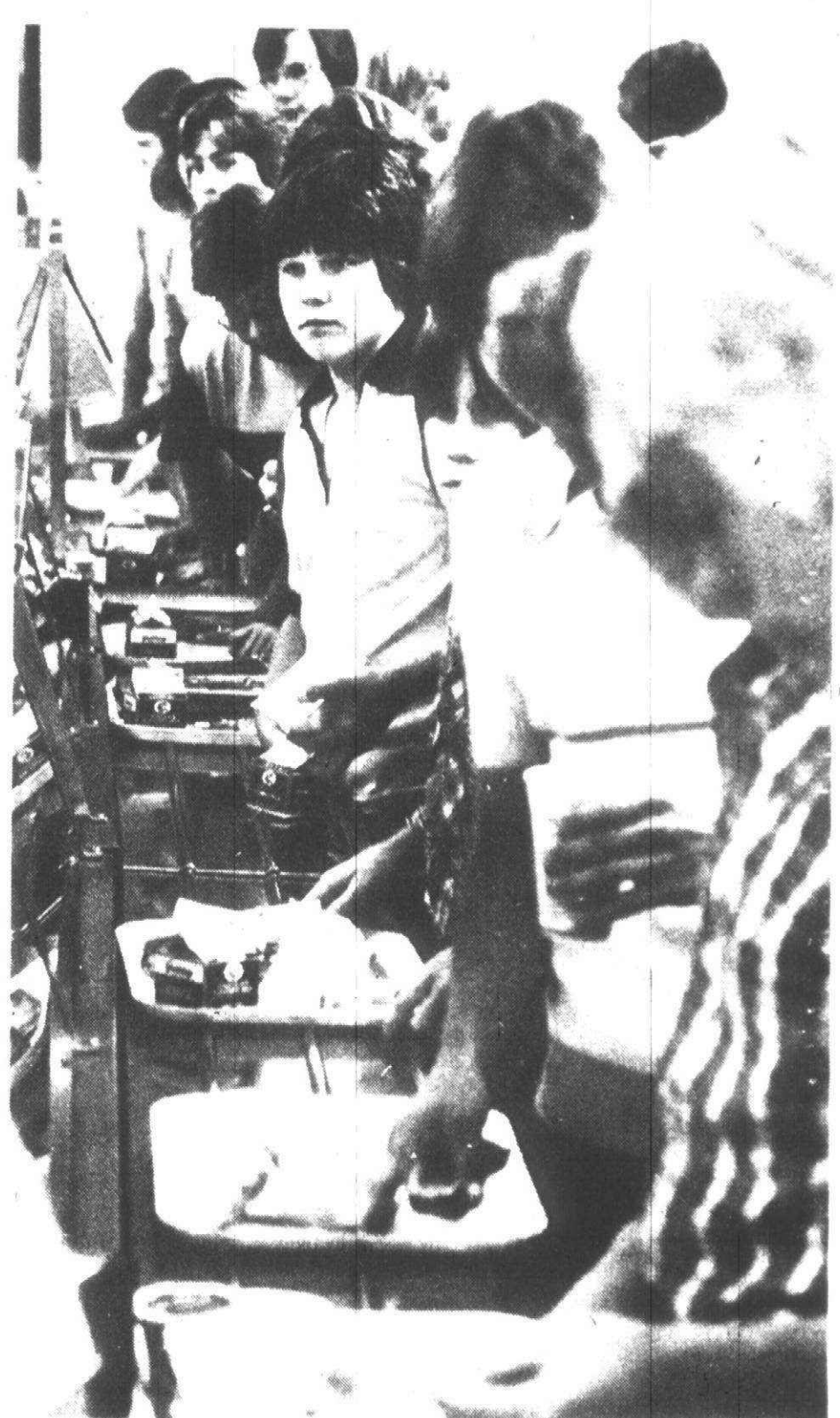
uling, students came to school at various times and were often driven by their parents. Police in Canton Township and Wayne County have been asked to help ease the congestion.

The new scheduling also forces the high schools to feed 4,500 students in less than two hours instead of spreading the feeding periods over several hours—the practice the past seven years under modular scheduling.

After rather long waits in line the first couple of days of school, the delays have been eliminated and students now spend most of their 40-minute lunch periods chatting at their tables instead of waiting in line.

Modular scheduling was dropped in favor of traditional because of the increased enrollment this fall at both high schools. Traditional allows for greater use of classrooms over a school day.

Bus drivers reply

Editor:

We, the Plymouth-Canton School District bus drivers, would like to answer the charges made by a certain Sunflower sub-division resident, Jerry Gibbons (see story in Sept. 11 Canton Observer).

The article states "School officials are calling it a mistake. An angry parent is calling it neglect."

We call it lack of supervision. In the article, our boss, Robert Houghton, asked one very important question, "Where are the parents?" Elementary-school age children need supervision at their bus

stops. They should be at their bus stop five minutes before the bus's scheduled arrival.

Children of that age tend to get very squiggly and haven't as yet acquired the discipline and patience to just stand and wait for their bus. They start playing games and run around. That's why drivers approach elementary stops with such extreme caution. The children need the guidance and supervision an adult presence provides.

We heartily suggest that Mr. Gibbons would graciously offer and consent to watch the chil-

dren at the stop on the corner of Chicester and Maidstone.

Parents in all subs are urged to work out a "watch" program, each taking turns so no one person is burdened or saddled with this responsibility every day.

Our job is children. We are concerned about their welfare and safety. It is beyond us how anyone could say we are neglectful or remiss in our duties and obligations. If a child is hurt, or needs assistance, we would do everything in our power to help that child. For anyone to sug-

gest otherwise is insulting and demeaning.

Occasionally we are called upon to watch out for suspicious persons or vehicles. We do this gladly and willingly. We are an effective network, the eyes and ears of the school district.

We take hours of special training, road and written tests, and classes to prepare ourselves adequately for our job. We test our buses every day to make sure they're in safe condition.

It is our responsibility to pick up your children as close to the scheduled time as possible, barring any unforeseen circumstances.

It is our responsibility to get the children seated properly on the bus and make sure they get to school and back home to their stop again safely.

It is the parents' responsibility to make sure that child is at the stop when the bus arrives.

We have no control over, nor can we be expected to be responsible for, what happens before we get to a stop or after we leave it.

Contrary to what Mr. Gibbons charges—which smacks of slander—the driver who picks up at Chicester and Maidstone is a concerned, caring and very competent driver and parent of two children. She would be first in line to come to the aid of a frightened, injured, lost or hurt child, as would any driver for the Plymouth-Canton School District.

We appreciate the support of our boss, Mr. Houghton, and his fairness in finding out both sides of this incident. Let's work together to keep our children safe.

ments unless the Legislature provides for full state financing.

IN SUMMARIZING the impact of the Tisch Amendment, the county's attorneys note:

"The Tisch Amendment would drastically reduce the tax revenues of Wayne County generated by

the ad valorem property tax. It would result in a shifting of the tax burden from local governments to the state. Further, it would make local governments increasingly more dependent on state appropriations.

"Although Tisch places a limit on the state's most equitable revenue resource (the income tax), it does not prevent the state from increasing the

rate or base of the Single Business Tax, nuisance taxes, or other taxes.

"Further, the state is not prohibited from authorizing local units to levy new taxes such as a county income tax. The tax structure that is likely to result would be more regressive (greater burden on low-income wage earners) than the current tax structure and be less conducive to economic growth."

IN SUMMARIZING the impact of the Headlee tax limitation proposal, Suchy and his staff noted:

"The Headlee Amendment is an attempt to place a limit on state spending at about 9.5 per cent of the personal income of Michigan. It further restricts the increase in property assessments to a rate no greater than the increase in the Consumer Price Index.

"The immediate short term effect of Headlee on Wayne County is minimal. It should be noted, however, that under Headlee personal income of Michigan is the total income received by persons in Michigan from all sources as defined and officially reported by the U.S. Department of Commerce or its successor agency. If this federal agency decides to radically redefine personal income, then the revenues available to the state will likewise be radically altered.

"Finally, many of the provisions in Headlee will undoubtedly be challenged in the courts. Certainly, the state will litigate those sections of Headlee which prohibit it from expanding existing services to local governments without fully funding such activities. How the courts will interpret these sections cannot be predicted."

director of elementary education for the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools. "It presents good information that kids can relate to what they see in the media."

When she was first approached by the league members on using the booklet in the schools, she gave copies to several elementary school principals and teachers for their reactions.

"All the feedback was positive," she said. "Everyone felt it would make a good supplement to our regular social studies program."

In addition to the book itself, the league's education committee prepared a teacher's packet with suggested activities, games, crossword puzzles and quizzes.

The project came about as a result of a brainstorming session by the women on the education committee.

One of members suggested the idea of finding a way to actually teach kids "why and how people run for public office and how you go about electing them."

According to league member Jane Stacy, the women not only wanted to inform children about the political process, they also wanted them to have fun learning about it.

After much discussion and a number of "rough drafts," the final manuscript was completed. The next step in the program was to find someone willing enough to print the booklet for distribution.

That's where Meijer's made its entrance.

"It's not all that unusual for us to get involved with community projects like this," explained Brian Michmerhuizen, manager of the Canton Meijer's.

approved, the constitutional amendment would take effect Dec. 31.

BY ROLLING back property assessments, the Tisch proposal would cut the value of millage in Canton Township by 50 per cent.

The five mills levied by the township for operation are currently worth \$1.4 million, according to Gorman. The two-mill police levy now is worth \$527,000, and the 1 1/4 mill fire levy is worth \$330,000.

Gorman suspects that passage of the Tisch Amendment would also affect

the amount of shared revenue that Canton receives from the state. The finance director figures the township will receive \$610,000 from the state in 1979.

"But the Tisch Amendment would certainly hurt state revenues too," the finance director said. "We'd probably receive less money from them."

Fees from building permits and licenses would be the township's only source of revenue that would not be affected by the Tisch Amendment, Gorman said. Those monies must be used to support the building department, however.

Main busier than often thought

Several years ago a circuit judge caused a furor among old-time Plymouth residents by referring to the city as a sleepy little city in the western suburbs.
If he were to return today he would find it far from being a sleepy little place. Instead he would find it one of the busiest and he would have to look no further than Main Street.

IT MAY COME as a surprise—even to old-timers—to learn that a recent count showed 7,397 cars traveled southbound from the C&O Railroad on Main Street in a 24-hour period. At the same time, about 9,303 autos traveled

southbound at the intersection of Byron and Main Street.
These figures were made official in a traffic count taken recently by the city engineer. The count was taken as a matter of curiosity after a long line of cars was held up at the Main Street railroad crossing.
As the line strung out, with motors running, the question arose as to how many cars pass by each day and how much gas is wasted each time the crossing is blocked.
Several interesting facts were brought out in the traffic count. On this particular day (Aug. 17) some 712 cars passed southbound from the rail crossing between 4-5 p.m. It was the

heaviest traffic flow of the day. It dropped back to 598 between 5-6 p.m.
Strangely, the heaviest flow on the southbound lanes at Byron came at the noon hour between 12-1 p.m. when 710 cars were checked. On the other hand, the low point came between 4-5 a.m. when only 23 cars passed on the southbound course from the rail crossing and only 24 on the northbound route at the Byron intersection.
Another interesting fact uncovered by the traffic count between 9-10 a.m. showed that there were 300 cars southbound from the railroad and 295 northbound, compared to 499 southbound from Byron and 408 on the northbound lanes.

And much to the surprise of many, the traffic over a 24-hour period is heavier at Byron and Main than it is at the railroad crossing and Main Street. The southbound lanes served 9,303 and the northbound 8,373 compared to the 24-hour period at Main and the railroad where 7,397 travelled southbound and 7,160 were counted in the northbound lanes.
This means an average of 30 cars an hour travel southbound at the C&O and Main during a full swing of the hands around the clock and 39 on the southbound lanes at the Byron intersection.
This is proof that Plymouth no longer can be called a sleepy little city—even by a circuit judge.





Starting school extra painful this year

Starting school may be more painful than many children expect.

In addition to the usual drudgery of homework and getting to bed early, more than 17,000 new school children in 35 Wayne County school districts may have to bring their immunization records up to date. That means a series of vaccinations for many children.

The school entrance immunization law requires that children entering Michigan schools for the first time be immunized against diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio, measles and German measles or rubella. New students in out-Wayne County schools must produce written evidence of having received vaccines against those diseases.

School children whose records are not up to date on Oct. 17 face being excluded from classes until their par-

ents show the vaccines are being administered.

THE EXCLUSION program is in its second year in Wayne County school districts.

Last year more than 4,150 out-Wayne County school children, about 24 per cent of all new students, were not adequately immunized. In several districts, said Dr. Perry Stearns, director of the Wayne County Health Department, more than half of all new school children were not fully immunized.

Last year, 415 students were excluded on Nov. 7, the first exclusion date. By the second exclusion date, Feb. 1, 246 students were excluded. And by the final May 1 exclusion date only 96 students had to be turned out of school.

According to Stearns, all but 15 returned to school.

Similar success, he said, is expected this year.

THERE IS A special stress on proper immunization this year. Wayne County health officials said.

Last winter's epidemic-level measles outbreaks in Wayne County and the rest of Michigan has stirred county health department into action.

More than 1,000 cases of measles were reported in out-Wayne County during the 1977-78 school year. Many of the persons afflicted with the diseases, he said, were in high school and college.

According to Stearns, the incidence of measles and rubella has been decreasing in the United States, but has jumped sharply in Michigan. While Michigan led the nation in the occurrence of measles and rubella last year, Wayne County and Detroit accounted for a sizeable portion of the state total.

"They weren't properly immunized to begin with," Stearns said of the county residents who came down with the disease.

That is a situation health department officials are trying to avoid by insuring that all Michigan students are properly immunized before starting school.

THE NEEDED vaccines may be obtained either from private physicians and following Wayne County Health Department walk-in clinics:

• The Wayne County Health Department Eloise Clinic at the Merriman-Michigan intersection. The clinic is open from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. and 1 to

3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. On Wednesdays the clinic is open from 1 until 8 p.m.

• The Taylor Clinic at 21201 Eureka Road, near Southland. This clinic will be open Tuesdays from 4:30 to 8 p.m. and Fridays from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. It will be opened Friday afternoons from 1 to 3:30 p.m. through October.

For information regarding other clinic sites around Wayne County, call the health department at 729-2211, ext. 390.

Stratford an idea of very unlikely pair

In the summer of 1953, as we drove through a small town in Canada, we saw a banner announcing the appearance of Alec Guinness in "Richard III."

As Shakespeare and Guinness buffs, we were tempted to try for tickets. But we showed on and later learned that we missed the birth of the most critically acclaimed repertory theater in North America—the Shakespeare Festival at Stratford, Ontario.

ITS EXISTENCE was due to the work of an unlikely pair—Tom Patterson, who conceived the idea, and Tyrone Guthrie, who knew how to deliver it.

Patterson, a "gentle little person" five-foot, six-inches tall, wrote for a Toronto trade journal. He was said to be an authority on municipal sewers.

Guthrie, a towering figure at six-foot, four-inches, was an English-born Irish-Scot with icy blue eyes. A cousin of the late movie actor, Tyrone Power, he had a reputation as a director of Shakespeare.

Patterson, as a soldier, had seen opera in Italy and classical theater in England. A native of Stratford, he thought that a place so named, with a river called Avon, and a street named Romeo, was a natural for an open-air Shakespearean festival. Promoting the idea, he begged everyone he knew in local and national government.

He was thought to be out of his mind.

The Stratford Jaycees gave Patterson \$50 to go to New York to approach Laurence Olivier. He could get nowhere near the great man.

A committee was formed in Stratford, and Patterson was authorized to phone Guthrie at his home in Ireland. The director agreed to visit Stratford to give his advice.

Guthrie told the committee he would direct the festival if the idea of an open air presentation was abandoned. "Open air performance," he wrote, "is only suitable for the kind of entertainment which can be absorbed with one ear, half and eye and almost no exertion of the intellectual faculties."

Guthrie recommended that a star and experienced theater personnel be employed. The production should take place on the sort of stage for which Shakespeare wrote his plays—a thrust platform with the audience almost surrounding the actors.

ALEC GUINNESS, who had worked with Guthrie on "HAMLET" in 1938, agreed to come from England to head the first cast.

His young son was ill, and Guinness thought a summer in a Canadian boy's camp would be good for the boy. The Guinness name helped make the first year a success.

In the absence of a suitable building, Guthrie recommended a tent. Built in Chicago, and large enough to hold

1,500 spectators, it helped add glamour to the Festival.

The Festival's artistic creed—quality first—came from Guthrie. "We are not in the business of selling film stars with big tits," he told one writer.

At the beginning, there were those who thought the project would fail. Two members resigned from the committee. Most of the people in town were neutral.

"I do not suppose," Guthrie later observed, "that in the greatest Athenian glory, the majority, even of Athenian citizens, regarded the works of Phidias, Euripides or Plato as anything like so important and interesting as the current price of fruit."

The committee kept on. Not every decision was momentous. "We spent hours deciding whether or not popcorn was going to be sold in the theater," recalled one member.

Everyone was relieved on the night Alec Guinness stepped forth as Richard. "Now is the winter of our discontent. Made glorious summer by this sun of York."

Guthrie recalled that the committee's treasurer "was reported to be eating once more and only occasionally walking in his sleep."

THAT WAS 25 years ago. This summer, we revisited Stratford to see the plays, and to observe the changes brought on by the passage of time and the success of Patterson's idea.

The tent was dismantled at the end of the 1956 season. It was succeeded by a magnificent auditorium in a beautifully landscaped park overlooking Lake Victoria. The Elizabethan balcony in the theater favored by Guthrie still is in use, but it has been made

mobile. The theater seats more than 2,200 people. No spectator is more than 65 feet from the stage.

Guthrie, who left Stratford after the 1955 season, was knighted in 1961. He founded the Tyrone Guthrie Repertory Theatre in Minneapolis in 1963, and died at his home in Ireland in 1971 at age 70.

Two additional theaters have been opened. The Avon, a converted cinema, has been used since 1956. The Third Stage, on the same side of the lake as the big theater, opened in 1971.

The Festival has provided employment for many at the theaters and in the businesses which serve visitors. The Festival staff has grown to 120 permanent employees, a number which increase to more than 600 during the height of the season, June to mid-October.

Some 68,000 spectators attended in 1953; in 1977 the figure exceeded a half-million. There were only two productions in 1953, both by Shakespeare. In 1978, there were 17, including many not written by the Bard of Avon.

The city, with a population of 19,000 in 1963, now has 25,000. The same attractive old residences, adorned

with perforated fretwork around the rooflines, grace maple-lined streets.

Accommodations have mushroomed. In 1953, there were two hotels and a motel with five rooms. It was difficult to get rooms in private homes. Today, in addition to the hotels, there are 14 motels; and private homes welcome guests with open arms.

There are many arts, crafts, and antique shops. The big British department store chain, Marks and Spencer, now has a Stratford branch.

The Stratford Country Club, within walking distance of the Festival Theatre, has grown from nine to 18 holes. So have the greens fees, now at \$9 a round for weekdays.

The Park, the Avon River and Lake Victoria are as attractive as ever.

Most of the lake's 28 white and six black swans, said to be the most photographed birds on the continent, came from the United States. In 1977, a small island in the lake was named for Tom Patterson, who started it all.

Some in the community may wish he hadn't. The majority are probably pleased that the idea Patterson refused to give up on has made their town world-famous.

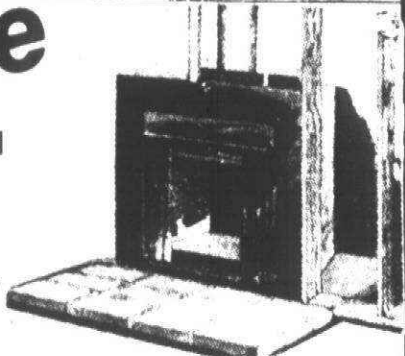

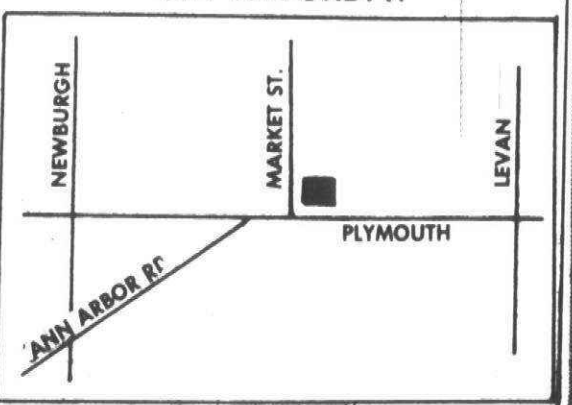

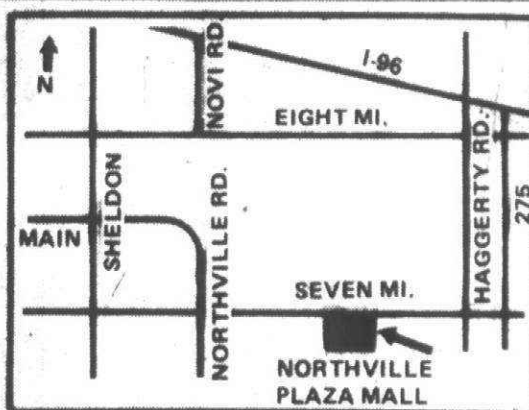

Tipping the Scales

Typical suburbanite except she's a compulsive eater

Joan (not her real name) is married, has three children and lives in a comfortable home in the suburbs. Her husband has a management-level position in a large corporation and his income provides Joan and the children with a comfortable life.

Tim, her husband, works from 8-5, and when home evenings likes to putter around the house or spend time with his children. Joan and Tim spend time caring for their finely furnished home, and their lawn is a carpet of green velvet.

By all standards, except for the minor ups and downs of everyday life, they are an ideal, average American family — with one exception. Joan is a compulsive eater.

YOU WOULDN'T KNOW this by

observing Joan's eating pattern at a party, restaurant or perhaps while visiting a friend.

The portions of food she chooses seem to be like those of a normal weight person or even a thin person; salads, vegetables, and a modest serving of meat. No desert or maybe a thin slice. Yet Joan weighs 250 lbs.

Behind a closed door in the privacy of her own home, Joan demonstrates a facet of her personality never visible to others, except the obvious results of a larger girth. For it is here that a hunger binge is born from a seemingly unimportant incident, frustration, or emotional quandary.

Joan can't pinpoint what triggers her binges. All she knows is that in a short length of time she gorges herself on potato chips, cookies, peanuts, cake or ice cream—whatever is immediately available for eating. In a half an

hour, she feels sickeningly full, overwrought with guilt and depressed about the additional weight which is now inevitable. She slumps into a chair, cries in despair, and wonders if she will ever be able to eradicate these self-destructive binges.

While this is not a report of a patient from medical annals or journals, it is a portrait of thousands of people, men and women, who act out this scene repeatedly in the course of a month or even weekly. The answers and hope for people living this nightmare has until now remained medically elusive.

But the fog is beginning to clear as researchers feverishly search for the answers which are hidden in the complex array of systems which sprawl through the human body. One such ray of hope is the discovery of the use of a drug called phenytoin. The results of its usage to help reduce the number of binges in a group of obese patients was encouraging. But until more thorough testing is completed only limited experimental usage of the drug will be permitted.

IN THE MEANTIME, there are steps that you can take to help prevent binging.

- Set up your environment so that binging is impossible by not buying the foods on which you binge.

- Trigger foods, such as potato chips, pretzels, and the like, should be avoided at all cost.

- If you feel a binge coming on, talk to yourself about the harm it will do to you and how terrible it will make you feel after its over.

- Submerge yourself in some activity so completely that there is no room for thoughts of food.

- Finally, and most importantly,

learn to identify what circumstances and emotions you were experiencing prior to the binge. WRITE IT DOWN! A pattern will emerge which will help you identify an impending crisis. You can then learn to cope with the offending irritant, if it cannot be removed. Professional help may be necessary. If so, seek it!

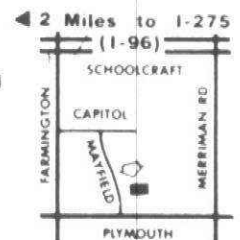

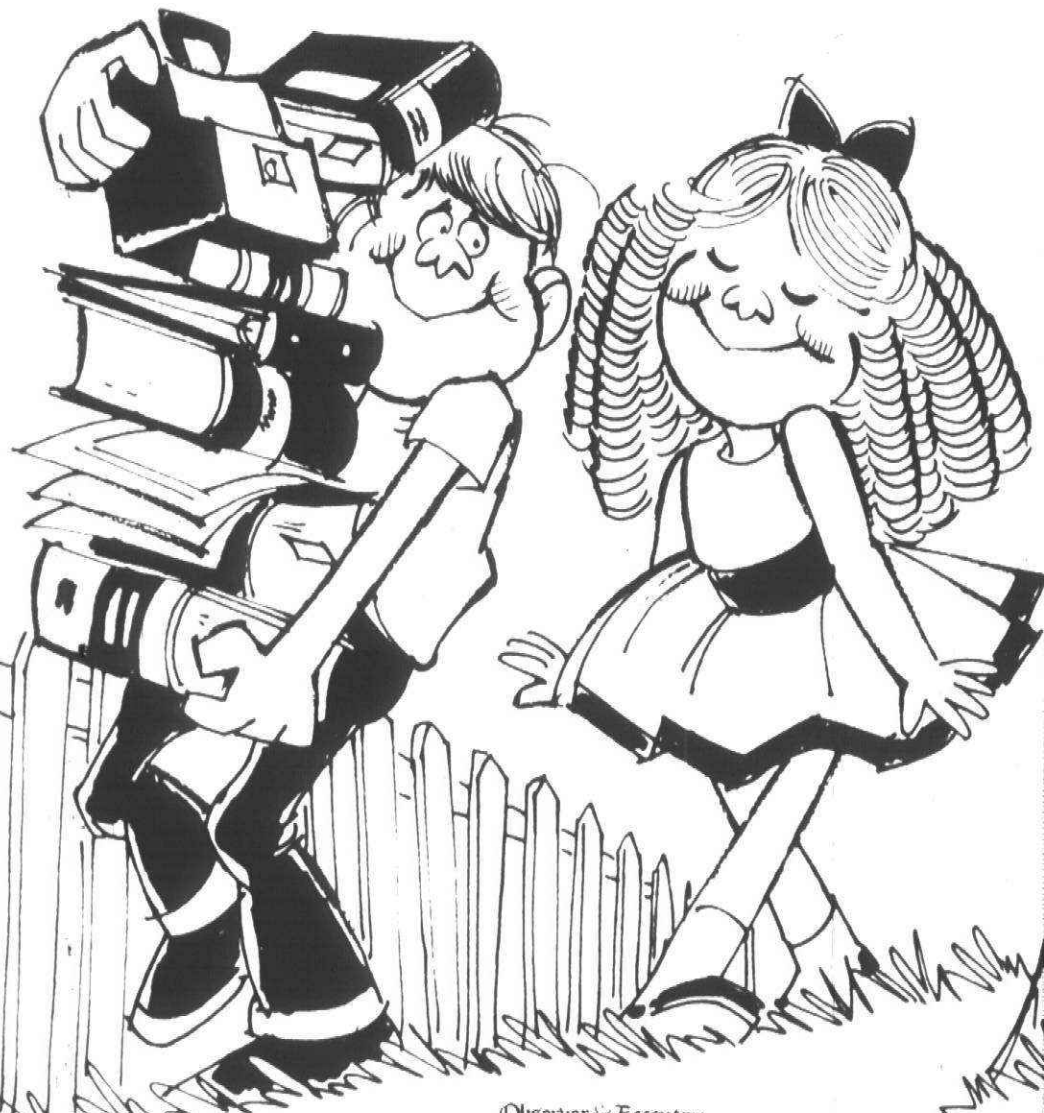

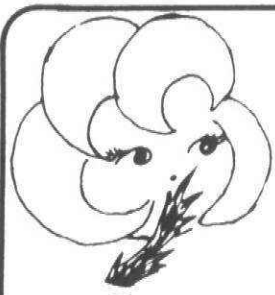


Barriers approved

Of the many ballot proposals we will face in November, the one which deserves very close scrutiny before voting is Proposition H—the so-called voucher proposal.

The constitutional amendment, if approved, would result in all parents being allotted a certain amount of money which they could spend to send their children to public, private or parochial schools.

A very basic impact of the proposal is that it would virtually eliminate all use of property taxes for school financing. The funds, of course, would be generated by an increase in other taxes, although it's not known for certain now which taxes would go up.

Before commenting on Proposal H, it should first be noted that the barrage of ballot proposals can result in havoc depending upon which proposals receive voter approval.

On the one hand, the Headlee amendment seeks to limit taxation while the Tisch amendment wants to cut property taxes in half. Both Headlee and Tisch seek to at least stop the spiral in government costs. Proposal H, on the other hand, would increase the amount of tax dollars now spent by Michigan residents on education.

Current figures indicate there are now some 200,000 students in the state attending private and parochial schools. The cost to the state, under the voucher plan, to educate these students would be some \$300 million.

So what would happen if Headlee and the voucher plan both passed? The voucher plan would require taxpayers to come up with an additional \$300 million from somewhere, while Headlee would be limiting total state spending in a way so that it could not increase greater than the cost-of-living. Obviously, millions of bucks would

have to be cut out of other programs to finance the voucher plan.

The stickler is that both are constitutional amendments and, if approved, both would carry equal weight and would have to be enforced—in spite of any conflict of intent.

BUT I HAVE more to worry about the voucher plan than how it might conflict with Tisch or Headlee.

What concerns me is that the voucher plan, in my opinion, is a serious frontal attack on public education in Michigan.

Furthermore, it's a misuse of public tax funds you and I pay under the pretense that it will be spent for public purposes.

The voucher plan is parochialism in disguise. And most of us can remember what an emotional battle was fought a few years ago when state voters turned down the parochial plan.

Unfortunately, the voucher plan could generate the same peak of emotion that we experienced in the past. The reason is that the issue gets clouded by those who argue for or against the use of public tax funds for church-supported schools. I don't believe that the church-state separation argument is the most central issue involved with the voucher plan.

There are many excellent private schools which offer an alternative education for parents whose children, for one reason or another, are not having their individual needs met by the public schools. Some of these excellent schools are church supported; many, however, are not.

The voucher proposal aims to benefit parents whose children attend private schools, regardless of any rela-

tionship to a religious organization. It makes no difference whether the school is private or parochial—the financial support would be made available.

Thus the distinction which should be made is public versus non-public. And the question becomes whether public funds should be used to support non-public schools? Or, put more succinctly, should public funds be spent for non-public purposes?

THE ARGUMENT, of course, is that the public funds are not going directly to the non-public schools but to parents who decide against enrolling their children in public schools.

Thus, the argument goes, the public funds are being sent to benefit children who are citizens of the state and have the same claim to public funds as other children. The argument suggests that children attending non-public schools are being discriminated against because their parents do not receive the same kind of return in services for their taxes as other parents.

Well, I just cannot buy that argument. In fact, I think it is totally lacking in logic and is constructed only in a weak attempt to justify the voucher plan.

The basic constitutional requirement we all live under, and have since Michigan became a state, is that the state is required to provide a public education to all its children. That is the only legal basis for spending tax funds on education.

Whenever parents, for whatever good reason, decide against enrolling their children in a public school they walk out from underneath the umbrella of the constitutional requirement. They also make a deliberate

choice to become ineligible to receive public tax funds. And there's nothing unjust about that.

I make a decision to become ineligible for certain public tax funds (unemployment payments) when I decide to continue working. I become ineligible for certain other public funds when my income reaches a point where I don't qualify for free school lunches or subsidized interest on a house mortgage. I become ineligible for state transportation funds if I choose to purchase a home, within 1.5 miles of the school my child attends.

There are dozens of choices you and I make which determine whether we are eligible or not for certain public funds. And one of those choices is whether our children attend a public or non-public school.

Yes, it is a financial burden to pay tuition for a non-public school and still pay property taxes to support public schools. But it's also a financial burden to pay taxes to support jails, mental institutions, and social services we may never make use of or for buses we may never ride or for state parks 200 miles away we may never visit, etc., etc.

And, yes, some parents cannot afford the tuition payments in the first place. But money is a key ingredient in the decision-making process we all undergo. If we can't afford a three bedroom home, we settle for a two bedroom, even if two of the children have to share a bedroom. If we can't afford a private school which we think offers the most for our children, then we settle for public school.

After all, we make the same choice when voting on school millage proposals. We vote on what we think we can afford, and decide to forego some quality which might be desirable, but not worth the higher cost. And that same choice must be made by those who desire non-public education.

To use public funds for non-public purposes would be a breach of contract between government and taxpayer. It could destroy public education, as we know it today, and would unquestionably result in an overall tax increase for all Michigan taxpayers. We need to take a close, cool, look at Proposal H.

Helping in politics can advance legal career

You're interested in a successful career as a lawyer?

In Wayne and Oakland counties, it might cost you some cold cash above and beyond the law school tuition.

It's not bribery, but some lawyers and judges say it works just as well.

The system is simple. The season is any election year. The transactions are campaign contributions. The recipients are judges. And the contributors are some of the same lawyers who practice before the judges regularly.

If you contribute, some members of the legal community say, good fortune will smile upon you and your clients. If you don't, you're in for some tough legal sledding.

In return for campaign contributions, critics claim, judges can deliver favorable rulings and dole out lucrative court assignments.

There are, of course, those who say "Bah, Humberg" and "Hogwash."

Members of the legal establishment, said West Bloomfield attorney Stuart Brickner, are reluctant to correct the system even though "everyone knows what's going on."

"No one wants to kill the goose that lays the golden egg," says Brickner, who has devoted years to studying the situation.

He has run for Oakland County Circuit Court three times and has tried to raise the judge-lawyer money pipeline as an issue in each unsuccessful try for the bench. He says Oakland County's legal establishment and "powerbrokers" have worked against his campaigns in the past.

NO ONE DENIES that lawyers pump vast amounts of money into judicial campaigns—especially the reelection drives of incumbents.

In the judicial elections of 1974 and 1976, for example, attorneys Bruce Leitman, Stanley W. Kurzman and Richard A. Campbell contributed more than \$3,000 to a number of candidates.

In the elections of 1972 and 1974, attorneys Walter R. Denison, Daniel C. Devine, Gerald R. Bartush and Charles J. Porter threw nearly \$2,500

to candidates for Oakland County Circuit Court, Probate Court, the state Appeals Court and Supreme Court.

Oakland Circuit Judge Alice Gilbert, of Birmingham, raised nearly \$60,000 for her primary and general election campaigns in 1976. Much of that money came from attorneys.

No studies, however, have been done establishing any definite connections between campaign contributions and preferential treatment.

"In an election year, I and a lot of other attorneys spend thousands of dollars," said Judith Dennehy Doran, a candidate for the Oakland County Circuit Court bench in November. "I'm not sure they (the contributions) are at all helpful to my practice."

She estimates that she sends between \$1,200 and \$2,000 to various judicial candidates in any one election year.

LAWYERS AND JUDGES say there's nothing wrong with the system. They say very few people take any interest in judicial races and it's up to them to put the best and the brightest on the bench.

Most lawyers uniformly discount the claim that they have to grease the palms of judges they deal with.

That opinion is not universal, though. A group of lawyers and judges, including Brickner and Mrs. Doran, is trying to implement a system to end the stumping for campaign money which accompanies every judicial race. Even members of the "Fair Committee," however, say the abuses are few and far between.

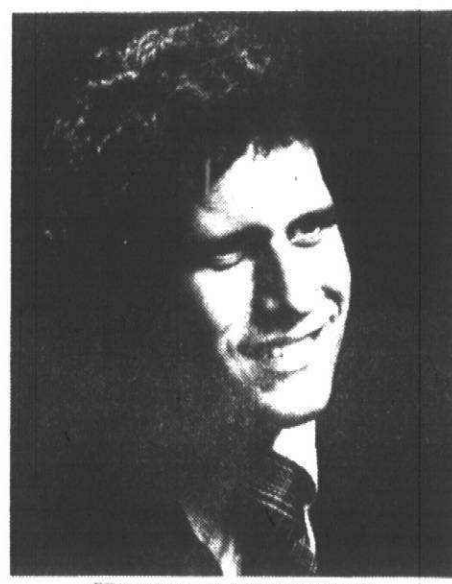
Their main concern is the judiciary's public image.

"SUPPOSE YOUR LAWYER had made no contributions (to a judge hearing your case)," suggests Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Victor J. Baum, of Livonia, chairman of the ad hoc Fair Committee.

"Say the other lawyer made a contribution of \$350. Say all the judge's calls were pretty much against you. Or say the decision went against you. What would you think?"

"What does it do to the public's confidence?"

A judge may not overtly throw a case, warns Baum, a 21-year veteran of the Wayne County Circuit Court bench.

No golden egg?

Very subtly, he says, a judge can make life easier for a lawyer who has helped grease his election skids.

"Suppose there's a lawyer who's just great at final arguments. That's his strength and everybody knows it. Then there's another lawyer, who happened to contribute to the reelection campaign. This lawyer's just so-so at oral argument."

"The judge decides that there'll only be four or five minutes for final arguments. Why, that's not enough time for the dynamite speaker to get warmed up. It'd be a definite advantage to the campaign contributor," he says.

Baum likes to speak in suppositions. He believes there are actually very few abuses. Most of them, he says, have occurred in Detroit's and Wayne County's courts.

BRICKNER IS MORE direct. He says point blank that judges "reward" lawyers who contribute to their campaign war chests.

"What happens," he says, "is the incumbents have the lawyers to use as a base. They have patronage to dole out. It works the same way as government does."

The "patronage," Brickner argues, is in the form of assignments. Judges can appoint lawyers to handle divorce cases, affairs for business which have gone into receivership, certain probate estates as well as the customary appointments to handle indigent cases.

Judges can also determine how much money in fees the lawyer will receive. In some cases, Brickner says, judges can even "order fees above the statutory limit."

"For an incumbent judge to raise campaign money is as easy as falling off a log," Baum says. "If a man is a trial lawyer, he has a very difficult time saying 'no.'"

"They're fearful of incurring the ill will of sitting judges," he says.

"I know. I felt the pressure when I was practicing law many years back," he adds.

No deals are cut, Baum and others say. It's all implied.

ONCE AGAIN, established lawyers and judges discount such charges.

"Brickner is wrong," one Oakland County lawyer said flatly.

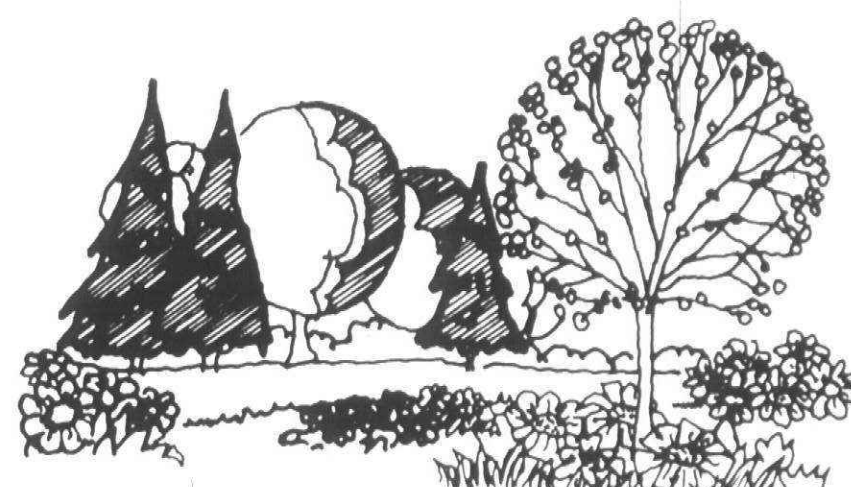
"If a business is in financial trouble and a receiver is appointed—there's darn good fees in that," he said. "But I doubt if a judge would have enough cases of that type to reward their contributors."

As for assignments to indigent defendants in criminal cases, Oakland County Circuit Court Chief Judge Steven Andrews said they are not that frequent and pay only about \$200 an assignment.

According to Andrews and his secretary, any lawyer who wants to receive criminal assignments contacts the court. Their names, they say, are put on a revolving list.

THERE MAY BE FEW abuses, but Baum, Brickner and others say judges, reelection committees and influential legal groups can and do strongarm attorneys into campaign contributions.

Bright future exists for Plymouth specialty shops

A recent article in the *Harvard Business Review*, "The Next Revolution of the Retailing Wheel," should gladden the hearts of many local retailers.

The authors, Malcolm P. McNair and Eleanor G. May, suggest that specialty shops which offer personal service, fashion, prestige and ego-enhancement, have a bright future indeed.

The authors conclude that the "automobile age" will shortly be displaced by the "electronic age." In the future, shopping for staples will be done by telecommunication.

THIS SCENARIO may sound like science-fiction to you now, but in 10 years it may become an accepted practice, according to the authors.

Mrs. Jones, about to retire for the evening, suddenly remembers she must do the family grocery shopping for the next week.

Does she get on her coat, hat, purse, car keys and trudge out into the cold night? No, she doesn't. She proceeds to the kitchen; removes the cover from her color-screen mini-computer terminal, pushes an entry key and in an instant, a display of fresh fruits and vegetables pops into view.

She likes the looks and, price of the

pears or apples or whatever and next enters her order. She does the same for meats, dairy items, baked and canned goods and sundries. When her order is completed, she notifies the store's computer of her bank account number to transfer funds for payment and indicates she will pick up the order at 9:30 a.m. Total elapsed time: 10 minutes.

The next morning her order is wait-

ing at curbside—no looking for empty shopping carts, no weighing up of fruit, no bread squeezing, and long, long check-out lines.

THE TRUST OF the McNair-May article deals with the authors' perception that shopping for staples is a "chore" for many consumers.

It takes time which they increasingly begrudge; time which could be

better used for more enjoyable pursuits, like hobbies, sports, community activities and shopping in specialty stores.

The good news for Plymouth retailers is that specialty shopping is not perceived as a chore by consumers. Specialty shopping is considered fun.

The consumer's ego is involved in specialty shopping. Buying that new high fashion dress, a unique gift, that

new tennis outfit or a rare wine for home entertainment is not a bore. Time for this sort of shopping is not begrudged.

When you couple that with knowledgeable, friendly, helpful salespeople—a warm, personal relationship—shopping becomes a job.

So take heart, those of you who labor in the specialty store vineyards, better times may be coming.

Detroit water audit mandated by law

Suburban customers of the Detroit water and sewer system will have a clearer picture of the system's financial affairs under a new state law.

The law was sponsored by State Rep. John Bennett (D-Redford) and signed by Gov. Milliken.

Another bill sponsored by Bennett to give suburban customers a voice in the operation of the water system was approved by the house but has been stalled in committee in the state senate.

THE NEW LAW requires the Detroit Water and Sewer Department be audited annually by certified public accountants selected by the state legislative auditor general. The results of the audit will be made public and submitted to the governing body of each local unit of government served by the system before Dec. 1 each year.

The new law further requires that there be at least one public hearing 120 days before any proposed rate increase is scheduled to take effect. Each local unit will have to be notified of the hearing by mail.

"The new law will ensure that local units served by the Detroit water system have reliable information about the financial operation of the water department," Bennett said. "In the

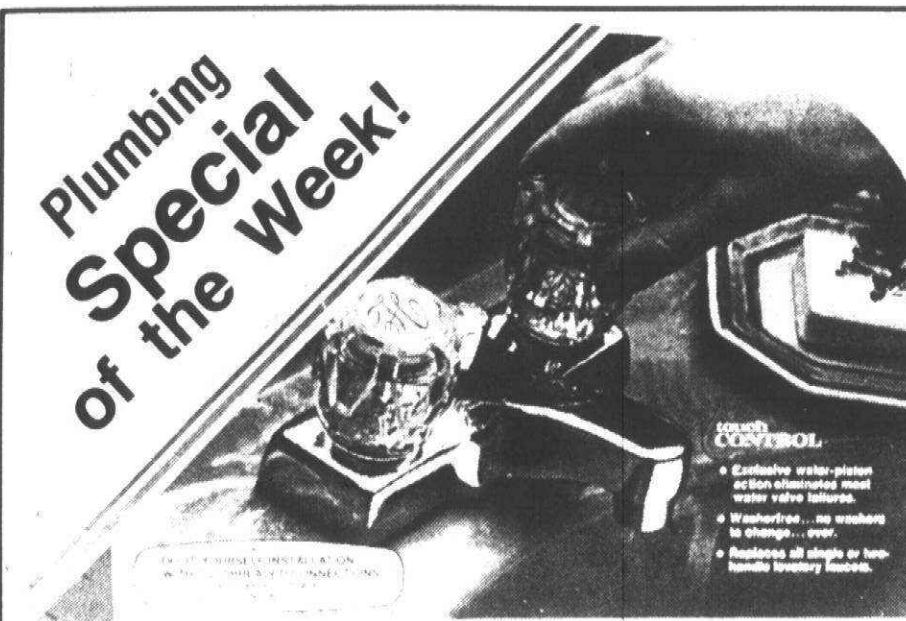
past, these communities have often had difficulty in obtaining information justifying rate increases and the financing of proposed capital improvement programs."

The required public hearings will provide suburban customers with some input into the rate-setting process and, together with the independent audit. They will help to expose deficiencies in the management of the department, Bennett said.

THE OTHER BILL which is stalled in a senate committee would restructure the water board to nine members, with four appointed by suburban customers and five appointed by the mayor of Detroit, who currently appoints all seven members.

Although the bill cleared the house more than a year ago, it has been stalled in the senate municipalities and elections committee. Bennett said he will try once more in the fall session to get the bill reported out and passed.

Bennett added, "Since the suburban water customers provide about 80 per cent of the operating revenues of the water system, it is imperative that the suburbs have a strong voice in its operation to make sure that the system is operated in an efficient manner for the benefit of all its customers."

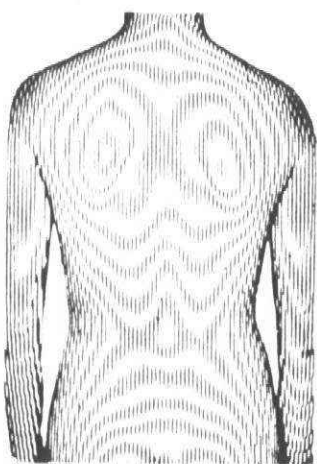
CHIROPRACTORS SEEK RESEARCH VOLUNTEERS

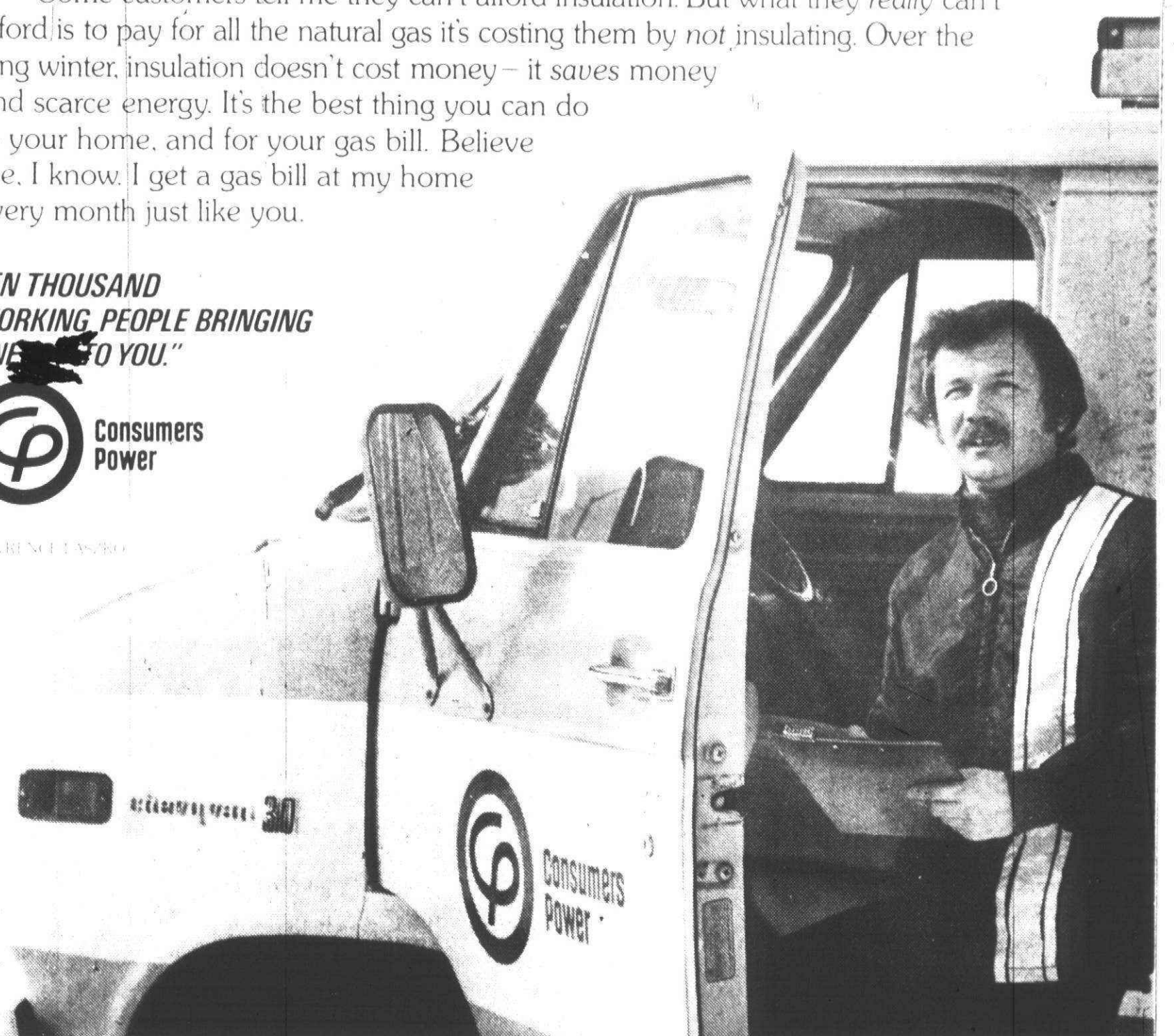

Hang on to farmland

There are some things that can't be replaced. One of those things is farmland. Canton's agricultural acres are at the heart of a controversial question slated to appear on the Nov. 7 general election ballot.

The question asks, in essence, if Canton should purchase development rights to its farmland to form a permanent agricultural district.

Although it means Canton residents will pay four more mills during a 20-year period if they choose to approve the proposal, studies say the move will keep taxes lower in the long run.

There are no guarantees, however. Yes, there will be problems if the proposal is approved.

But look around you at some of the older Detroit area suburbs and you will see why we support this measure.

There is a pattern to the rise and fall of a suburban community. First, there is an exodus from one place to another. It happened during the 1950s when such communities as Redford Township and Garden City grew. It is happening in Canton now.

People moved into these new suburbs from Detroit in search of their own patch of green, in search of a quiet place to raise their children, in search of a life style they couldn't find in an older city setting.

As more people made the move out of the city, schools in the new suburbs sprouted and communities struggled with the problems of rapid growth. Canton residents know all about these problems, because they face them now.

Schools are full to capacity. There aren't enough sewer lines to accommodate new homes. Subdivisions and shopping centers spring up overnight. Rural becomes urban.

There is a time when a suburb seems to strike a perfect balance, when it is a vigorous, healthy happy community.

It seems like everyone wants to get in on a good thing, so the community grows and grows until it can't grow any more.

Since no one tries to control that growth, it goes with little direction.

League's work cut out

Our friends in the League of Women Voters have their work cut out for them this year. Michigan's Nov. 7 ballot will have 11 state proposals to confuse the voter.

The league, you will recall, is the nonpartisan group that researches public issues and works to inform all voters about them. The 4,000 Michigan members decided last year to make a two-year project of studying the financing of government services.

It's not theoretical study. No less than six ballot proposals—including two tax limitation amendments—have fiscal implications. Most of the 11 ballot proposals were put there by special interest groups with something to gain, and so it will be refreshing to have the League of Women Voters shed its impartial light.

The league was founded in 1920 as an outgrowth of the old National American Women's Suffrage Association. Once the women got suffrage, the organization kept going in order to help inform 20 million new voters. In the process, it has helped enlighten more than a few men, too.

We have a selfish interest in seeing the league probe into these thorny issues with us. We've worked on many projects together. Our unselfish motive in raising this topic is to remind everyone that Sept. 10-16 is League of Women Voters Week. Happy 58th anniversary!

In the flood of junk mail that finds its way into The Stroller's mailbox almost every morning, there came a brochure from one of the candidates for state office.

It was an attractive brochure. It was well laid out, and the type was easy on the eye. But it was one of the strangest bits of campaign literature The Stroller has ever received.

It contained very few words about the candidate. It didn't reveal his plans or promises. It mentioned little about his background or what brought him to the point of choosing a political life.

People are fickle. When they get boxed into their subdivisions, they think again of the pleasures of open spaces. The ones who can afford it move on. The ones who can't stay and become senior citizens with limited budgets.

Schools close. Businesses move on to greener pastures. It happens over and over again.

There is little reason to expect the pattern to change if Canton trades in its future for present gratification.

Maybe the energy crisis will prevent the constant moving further out from Detroit. Maybe some of the substantial houses springing up in Canton will become too big to heat and too roomy for smaller families.

But most likely, the way to keep Canton vibrant is to keep it the same kind of community that made it desirable in the first place.

We must realize that maintaining an agricultural district brings with it a passel of problems. After all, small farms aren't economically feasible anymore.

But worse problems come from uncontrolled growth. We don't need to predict the future. We only need to look around us.

An untouchable tax-raiser

It is fashionable, in the Headlee and Tisch anti-tax circles, to rant at "politicians" and "bureaucrats" as the perpetrators of excessive taxing and spending.

Students of statecraft, however, know the real world is considerably more baffling to deal with. Politicians and bureaucrats aren't entirely to blame.

A case in point is an arbitrator's award to Local 502 of the National Union of Police Officers. That local represents 650 deputies in the Wayne County sheriff's department.

So incensed are the folks who have to pay the bill—the Wayne County Board of Commissioners—that they have voted to appeal the arbitrator's decision to the State Supreme Court.

In their view, the arbitrator is the bad guy. The board is 26-1 Democratic, and the object of their disaffection is William Haber, PhD, revered expert on labor economics, former dean at the University of Michigan, former head of the Michigan Democratic Party's Haber Commission on party reform, and so on.

THE COUNTY, you must understand, is reeling under a \$12 million deficit. Vice-chairman Richard Manning (D-Redford) says the wage and fringe improvements in Haber's award would cost the county nearly \$2.5 million this year and more than \$3.8 million next year.

The real blow, however, is that the county figures it will have to lay off 600 regular and 300 federally-subsidized CETA workers. In other words, 900 workers—15 per cent of the total general government work force of 5,600—may get the axe in order to pay off the deputies.

(If it strikes you as odd that the improvements for 650 deputies are the equivalent of the total costs for 900 other workers, the explanation is that many of the other workers are paid only partly by county funds and largely by federal funds.)

The county can't lay off the deputies to cut costs. The arbitrator's award says it is "mandatory that the sheriff maintain a minimum standard of personnel safety, and that the number of budgeted positions in each division, as of July 1, 1974, shall

be maintained. The detective bureau shall be maintained at its budgeted strength as of July 1, 1974."

The deputies are to get wage increases of 7.7, 5 and 5 per cent over three years, dental insurance, a group plan for insuring their personal automobiles, a cost-of-living increase for retirees, removal of the ceiling on cost-of-living allowances, use of 25 per cent of the county's computer time for processing of union grievances—and on and on.

TOUGH LUCK for the politicians, you say? Think again. If deputies can't be laid off, then senior citizens services, hospital services, public health services and the like may go. You may have to stand in longer lines to do business with the county. The suburban goal of an out-county service center may go down the tube.

The people elected the county commissioners. Yet they don't have the freedom to balance and juggle between essential services. An arbitrator has thrown a cloak of sanctity over one group of employees, and other services can go hang.

Haber isn't one of those elected politicians or bureaucrats Headlee and Tisch talk about. Yet he may wind up having more to say about the course of county government than any single politician, bureaucrat or group of voters.

Arbitrators and courts are running up the costs of government all over the place. Haber isn't the only one running amok.

In such an atmosphere of adjudicated expenditures, we should be wary about bowing to the altar of "tax limitation" for our governmental salvation. Our collective bargaining and arbitration laws, rather, demand some scrutiny.

He did just that. He got the order and went on to become the top sporting goods salesman in Michigan.

The Stroller looked at the political brochure again and wondered if the present generation has lost the art of selling its own product.

A judge who was explicit in sentencing

Chances are extremely slim that any of you ever had the pleasure of knowing personally one Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales. He made it to the big leagues in only one sense, and then only indirectly as the motivating force behind a literary gem.

Cosmopolites probably would have nicknamed him Joe. To our Jewish friends he might have been Manny. The Irish probably would have dubbed him Mike. In a priest's confessional, Xavier would have fit to some degree.

It took an Irishman, Foley by name—who admits there's a bit of Scotch in his blood (water on the side, please)—to bring Senor Gonzales to my attention.

OF ALL THE Foleys in the phone directory, the one referred to happens to go by Thomas J. Foley. Although it is his nature to smile and laugh more than frown and growl, this strapping six-foot-plus ex-footballer wears black so often one might think him a professional mourner.

He isn't, of course. In real life, Tom is a judge of the Third Judicial Circuit of Michigan, headquartered in Detroit's City-County Building.

IN NO WAY can this be interpreted as a campaign plug for Tom. He doesn't need it, for like nine other incumbents on the Wayne County Circuit Court bench, he is unopposed for re-election.

What it is, instead, is an explanation of how I came to know of Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales.

Like every Irishman I've ever known, Tom enjoys a chuckle. Oldtime football fans may remember him as Red Foley, an outstanding end first at Southeastern High School and then the University of Detroit under Gus Dorais.

He had to be tough both places, just as he did as a Navy lieutenant on the USS Sangamon, which was one of our ships blown out of the water at Okinawa.

From the Detroit legal firm of Goetz, Goetz & Foley, specializing in corporate law, Tom jumped to the bench in the election of '66. His unopposed re-election in '72 has kept him there to this day, commuting from the home he has occupied for 25 years in Plymouth Township.

NOT TOO LONG AGO, Michigan's Supreme Court instructed all circuit judges that their records be absolutely explicit at the time of sentencing. Red Foley asked the chief justice if such as the following would be explicit enough. It is a verbatim transcript of a sentence imposed upon a defendant in the Federal District Court of the Territory of New Mexico in 1881. He thought I might enjoy it too. So may you:

"Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales, in a few short weeks it will be spring. The snows of winter will flee away, the ice will vanish, and the air will become soft and balmy. In short, Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales, the annual miracle of the years will awaken and come to pass, but you won't be there.

"From every tree top some wild woods songster will carol his mating song, butterflies will sport in the sunshine, the busy bee will hum happy as it pursues its accustomed vacation. The gentle breeze will tease the tassels of the wild grasses, and all nature, Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales, will be glad, but you.

"You won't be here to enjoy it because I command the sheriff or some other officers of the country to lead you out to some remote spot, swing you by the neck from a knotting bough of some sturdy oak, and let you hang until you are dead.

"And then, Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales, I further command that such officers retire quickly from your dangling corpse, that vultures may descend from the heavens upon your filthy body until nothing shall remain but bare, bleached bones of a cold-blooded, copper-colored, blood-thirsty, throat-cutting, chili-eating, sheep-herding, murdering son-of-a-bitch."

MUCH THE SAME yarn is told in H. Allen Smith's "Lost in the Horse Latitudes," but Smith went on to quote what the accused then told the judge. In part, it allegedly went like this:

"That I have taken human life I do not deny, but it was under circumstances of the greatest provocation. So determined was this court to add another to its already long list of slaughtered victims that I early foresaw my doom was sealed.

"You and your blood-thirsty jury remind me more of a lot of buzzards hovering an expected victim than of a body of men supposed to guard and honor the principles of human justice. Hear me, you half-starved hyena! You cannot break my spirit!

"As I gaze into your bloated, whiskey-fogged face, I find no surprise at your conduct. With mock solemnity and cruel sarcasm, you have consigned me to an ignominious death.

"Very well, you disheveled barbarian, you wild-eyed, dirty-nosed, pot-gutted, carnivorous offspring of a cross-eyed maggot. I want you to understand that your words hold no terror for me.

"As for hanging by the neck until I am dead—may God blast your dirty old soul."

Was that the end of it? Not quite. Legend has it that Jose Manuel Miguel Xavier Gonzales broke jail a couple of days later, escaped into the hills, and was never recaptured.

Where men are defined by their blood lust and women by the dead animals on their backs (and elsewhere), the "sports" aspect is indeed a storybook life.

Geake announces support for Headlee tax limit

State Sen. Robert Geake (R-Northville) recently endorsed the proposed Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment before a group of teachers, members of a profession traditionally opposed to the concept.

At the same time, the 42-year-old legislator blasted the proposed Tisch and School Voucher plans calling them "contrary to the best interests of education and the people of Michigan."

During a speech to South Redford teachers, Geake supported the Headlee proposal which he, as co-founder of Taxpayers United for Tax Limitation, helped write. Geake is a member of the group's legislative advisory committee.

"I firmly believe that the Headlee proposal represents a sound and logical approach to halting the rapid growth in state spending," he said. "It would allow the overall state budget to grow in line with available revenues, safeguard the right of local communities to determine their own spending priorities and give voters control over new taxes."

"It would not result in drastic cut-backs in funding for vital state services, such as education," he said. "It would simply force the legislature to do what it should have been doing all along—set priorities and live within our taxpayers' means."

If approved by the voters this November, the Headlee proposal would freeze state spending at its current level, which is about 9.4 per cent of the combined personal incomes in Michigan.

It would also require the state to back up with financial support any state-mandated programs, limit revenue

nues from local property taxes to the rate of inflation and require voter approval of increases in local taxes.

In comparison, Geake said the Tisch proposal would have a "devastating effect on governmental services."

"Funding for virtually every state service, including education, would have to be slashed unbearably," he said. "There's nothing I would rather see than the fat cut out of our state budget. The Tisch proposal, however,

would go much further than that. It would delve into the muscle, right to the bone in many cases."

"California is just now beginning to feel the impact of passage of its tax cut proposal, which was similar to the proposed Tisch amendment. I hope our voters will have the foresight to leave California's severe financial problems right where they are," Geake added.

The Tisch plan calls for a 50 per cent cut in property taxes and a limitation

on annual property tax increases to 2½ per cent.

It would allow an increase of one per cent in the state income tax and permit local income taxes to be levied, if approved by the voters.

Geake also declared that the proposed school voucher amendment poses a serious threat to both public and non-public education as we know it in our state today.

The school voucher plan would eliminate property taxes as a means of financing schools and leave it up to the legislature to raise the state income tax and the single business tax to compensate for the lost funding.

"With total funding for education appropriated and disbursed by the state, it is entirely conceivable that local control over public education would be eliminated," he said.

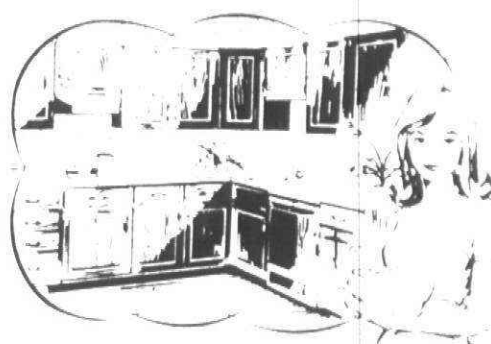

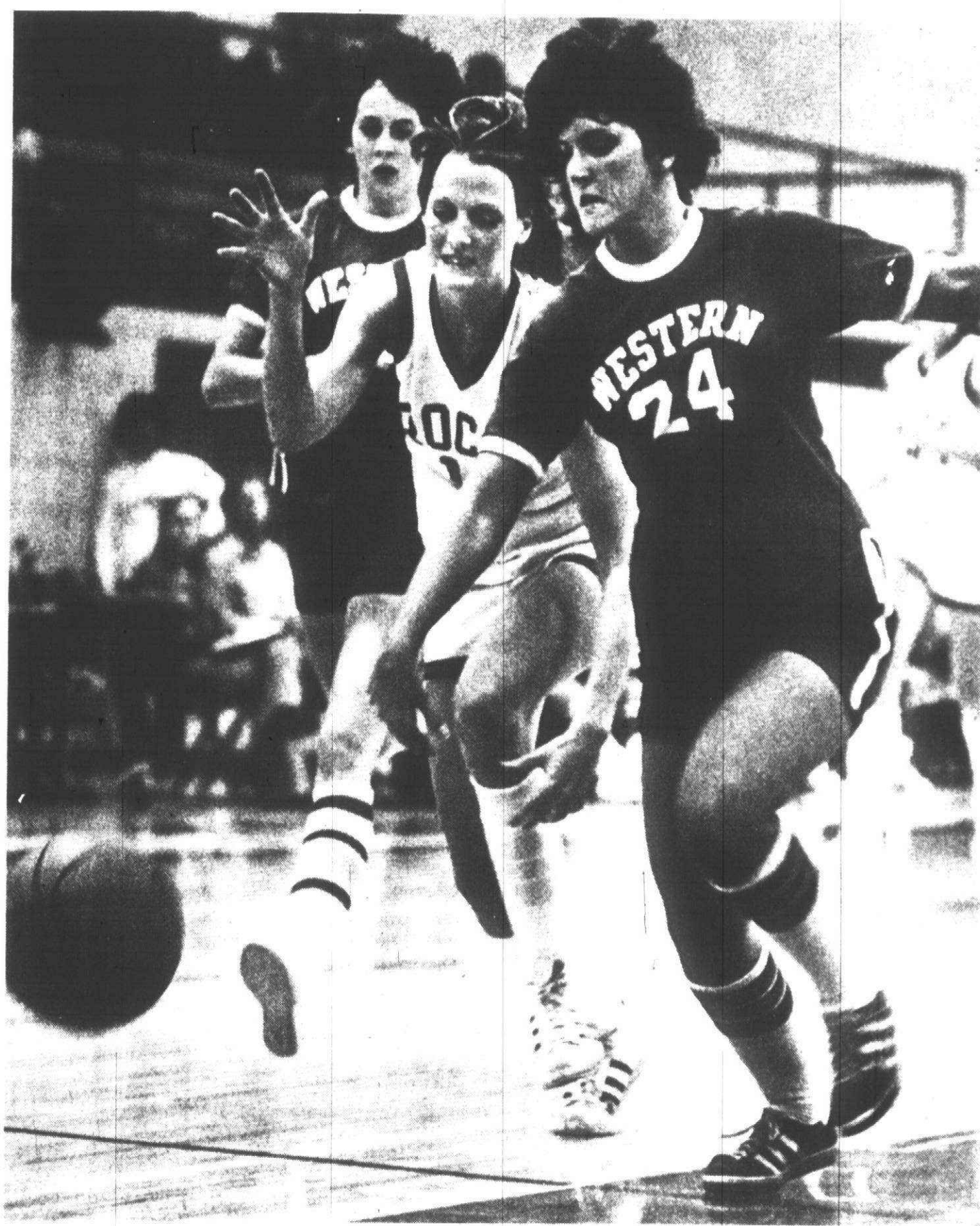
The powerful Spartans whipped the Rocks, 24-39. Canton finished third with 60 points.

Gridders better than expected

A most successful opening week for both Plymouth Canton and Plymouth Salem football teams also resulted in one of the most disastrous starts the Good Doctor has ever experienced in his predicting career.

Say what you will about those Livonia Bentley injuries, but the fact still remains Canton shut out the Bulldogs, 12-0, Friday night for its first-ever opening season victory.

I could say it was just a typographical error when last week's paper read "Bentley by 12" rather than "Canton by 12," but I must admit the only error was made by the predictor, himself.

It wasn't one of the strongest Bentley squads in recent years, but one can't take away from the fact that the Chiefs came out ready to play, hit some people on the interior line, and played with the kind of inspiration that makes a team a winner.

Coach Dave Schuele says he played conservatively in the final quarter, and didn't open up the offense because of the 12-point lead at halftime. But it was apparent, no matter what style of play was exhibited, that the Chiefs thoroughly dominated the entire game.

And this has to be a positive sign for any fan who has followed the Chiefs in the short six-year history of the school. This was only the 10th victory for the Canton football program and the third since Schuele took over the squad in 1976.

I definitely saw some talented athletes on the Bentley gridiron last Friday night. The prospect of the Chiefs winning more games this season isn't all that unrealistic.

I said last week that if Canton beat Bentley (and I didn't think they would), there was a chance for the Chiefs to win three games this year.

Well, let's revise that a bit. I think a realistic goal for all the Canton football players and fans is to finish with a better than .500 record, simply put, a 5-4 overall mark.

After what I saw last week, I think the Chiefs are capable of winning five games—if they keep their heads on straight and maintain a solid attitude.

The mere thought of Canton winning five games is not only exciting for me, but should be something the players should strive for.

What a boost it would be for a program which has been down for so long.

THIS WEEK'S GAMES

The Chiefs host Dearborn Hts. Annapolis Friday night at 8 p.m., and there isn't a better time than now for Canton to reach step two in that quest for a 5-4 record.

The Cougars come off a resounding 31-0 defeat to Inkster Cherry Hill, where they showed signs of not being a very good football team. While Annapolis is physically bigger than Canton, which isn't much of a surprise since no team can be smaller than the Chiefs, Canton showed signs of being a tougher team up front than most people expected in that win over Bentley.

It, by no means, will be an easy game against Annapolis, but if Canton doesn't get a case of "fumbleitis," it may enjoy its first-ever two-game winning streak in the school's history. Canton by 5.

PLYMOUTH SALEM may be inexperienced but it too is a better football team than most expected, including myself. While Livonia Franklin didn't have one of its strongest teams in recent years, everyone has to be surprised with the ease of the Rocks' first victory.

The defense, especially, was extremely tough against what was considered a decent Patriot offense. And what more can you say about Rich Hewlett and his powerful wish-bone offensive machine.

It hard to call a game "pivotal" after only one week of the prep season, but Salem's Centennial Park encounter with Dearborn Saturday night at 7:30 p.m. is just that.

This game should tell us how good the Rocks really are. I still don't think they are contenders for the Suburban Eight League title, especially after seeing what Dearborn Edsel Ford and Trenton did to their opponents last week, but the Rocks could be a factor in the race, and possibly aim for third place if they get the best of Dearborn.

If Salem loses to Dearborn, expect them to be just one of those "run of the mill" teams who will place fourth or fifth in the league race.

The Patriots are very big and strong but oh, so slow. Salem is small but has a lot of quickness. I pick speed over size this time—but only by a touchdown. Salem by 7.

Football teams home this week

Plymouth squads eye 2d victories

It may only be the second week of the prep football season but Plymouth-Canton fans can proudly visit the Centennial Park gridiron this weekend knowing that both Plymouth Canton and Plymouth Salem are still undefeated.

The Chiefs of Canton, enjoying their first-ever opening season victory over Livonia Bentley, 12-0, last week, will try to make it an unprecedented two wins in a row when they open their home schedule with a non-league battle against Dearborn Heights Annapolis Friday night at 8 p.m.

The Salem Rocks, fresh off a convincing 28-19 triumph of Livonia Franklin, open their defense of the Suburban Eight League crown Saturday night when they entertain Dearborn High School starting at 7:30 p.m.

CANTON HEAD COACH Dave Schuele had every reason to rest and sip champagne after his Chiefs' blank-

ing of the battered Bulldogs. But it was back to the practice field Monday afternoon, as he hopes to raise Canton's record to a modest 2-0 before entering Western Six League competition next week.

"We're back to work," Schuele said. "I believe we can take them (Annapolis) if we go out and play good football."

The Canton mentor had nothing but praise for his Chiefs after the unexpected Bentley victory.

"I thought we displayed enthusiasm and very definitely made progress," Schuele said. "One positive thing is that we went out and hit from the start and didn't wait until the second half."

"You've got to give them credit. I thought the kids played a super game."

Annapolis beat Canton last season thanks to eight Chief fumbles. It was one of the worst performances Canton displayed in its winless 0-9 season. Schuele said this problem is his greatest concern going into Friday's game. The Chiefs fumbled twice last week

and could have scored at least one more touchdown against the Bulldogs without these mistakes, according to Schuele.

Annapolis suffered an embarrassing 31-0 loss to Inkster Cherry Hill last week. The Cougars have scrapped the option and now play power football under a new coaching staff. They have good size on the interior line, but Schuele says they looked disorganized against Cherry Hill.

SALEM HEAD COACH Tom Moshimer is also smiling after his Rocks dominated Franklin in their season opener. Salem held a commanding 28-7 lead in the fourth period until the Patriots scored two touchdowns against the reserves.

"I'm very, very happy with the attitude of all the kids," the Salem mentor said. "We've made progress but we still have a long way to go."

"I think the mistakes we are making are fundamental errors. But the kids

are very receptive and don't make any excuses or alibis."

The Rocks face a big, strong Dearborn squad this week, which comes off a 13-0 victory over Class B Southgate. Although the Patriots lost star quarterback Dennis Scala to graduation, they still have a majority of their team returning from a 6-3 season. The big name in the Dearborn lineup is Mike Casanowski, who doubles as a fullback and linebacker, and has the strength to overpower his opponents.

Salem's interior line gives up a lot of size and weight to Dearborn's 200-pound-plus gridders. Moshimer feels the key for Salem is to rely on its overall quickness which was a big factor in the Franklin victory.

"We're giving up a lot of pounds (to Dearborn) but we're quick up front," Moshimer said. "The only way to beat them is with quickness. We have to play like fast ants this week. Our line of scrimmage must be quicker because they are too strong."

Plymouth's Wall loses playoff

If a lesson can be learned from the outcome of the men's 10th Observer & Eccentric Golf Tournament last weekend at Whispering Willows, it would be not to play a course until one actually gets into the competition.

Three of the four flight titlists—Mike Kerr, Livonia, Championship Flight, John Ruggiero III, Livonia, Flight 2, and Najib Yazbak, Bloomfield Hills, Flight 3—never set eyes on the Livonia course until they teed off Saturday.

Dave Provine, a Livonia resident and Flight 1 champ, had much more experience with the course than his counterparts. Provine played Whispering Willows for the first time four days before the tourney began.

Kerr and Dave Wall, a Plymouth resident and a former low actual Championship Flight winner, waged a neck-and-neck battle both days of the competition.

The two finished tied at 139 after the regulation 36 holes and needed a two-hole sudden death playoff to determine the champion.

Both carded pars on the 460-yard, par-five first hole during the playoff.

Wall missed a five-foot putt for a birdie that would have ended the duel, and Kerr sank a three-foot putt to save par and force another extra hole.

Kerr used a two iron off the tee on the narrow 337-yard, par-4 second hole and landed in the fairway. Wall, using a driver, put the ball in the woods.

Wall made an excellent recovery and placed the ball with his second shot on the green, 12 feet from the pin. Kerr hit a wedge shot a foot from the pin and easily earned the birdie putt. Wall missed his putt and that ended the playoff.

"I wasn't too disappointed," said Wall. "I really had my chance on the first extra hole, but Mike closed the door on me with a great second (wedge) shot. This was the best I ever shot in the tourney."

Wall posted a round of 69 Sunday after opening with a 70 on Saturday. He eagled the 360-yard, par-4, 17th hole to pick up two strokes on Kerr in the late goings and force the playoff.

Kerr, who finished with two consecutive birdies Sunday and who collected seven birdies in all during that round, carded a 67. His opening score was 72.

"I had a great start with birdies on five of the first seven holes," said Kerr. "That really got me pumped up and ready to go. I was hitting close for a while (to the pin on approaches), then my putting came around."

"Those greens were probably the best I've ever putted on a public course," Kerr added. "Any time you shoot a 67, you really love the course. Those rounds don't come often."

John Van Vleck, a Farmington Hills resident who had won the Championship Flight title the past two years, took himself out of contention Sunday when he skied to a round of 84 after opening with a 71.

Provine, who just moved to Livonia in May, carded 154 on rounds of 78 and 76 to pace the field in Flight 1. "On Saturday, I was putting well and today (Sunday), I putted poorly but got to the green."

Manny Agabashian, from Livonia, won a five-way playoff with Rich Wheeler of Westland, Dan McNamara of Livonia, Mike Vaughn of Canton and Dennis Perry of Farmington, for second place in that flight.

Agabashian birdied the first extra hole and all the others scored pars.

Ruggiero put together rounds of 80 and 79 for a 159 total to edge Tom Blazer, also a Livonian, by two strokes for the Flight 2 championship.

Ruggiero recorded four birdies Sunday and three Saturday during a couple of scrambly rounds.

Yazbak, who has only been golfing three years, used a good driving performance to total 181, four shots better than Angelo Fratarcangeli, a left-hander from Canton, for low actual in Flight 3.

The low net (handicap) winners in the various flights were Mike Cordon, Garden City, Championship Flight, 137; Provine, Flight 1, 136; Ruggiero, Flight 2, 129; and Yazbak, Flight 3, 125.

Will U-M be over-confident?

Father, son to team in ministry

Philip Krist never intended to be a pastor. And even after he decided on that calling, his plans didn't include working with his pastor father.

David Krist certainly would not have urged his son to go into the ministry. His beliefs as an Assemblies of God pastor hold that man just cannot do that.

But in the coming year, the two will be working together at United Assembly of God in Plymouth, the father as senior minister for the congregation of some 200 families and the son as assistant pastor in charge of the youth program.

And both see the hand of God working in the way things have turned out.

Phil, who will be joined in his youth ministry by his bride, Becky, is a 1974 graduate of Churchill High School and earned a bachelor degree this spring from Southeastern College in Lakeland, Fla.

When he began college, he said, he was going to major in education.

He had grown up the son and grandson of pastors, and he had watched his father move from responsibilities in Branson, Dundee and Holland, Mich., coming finally to the Parkdale Assembly of God in Livonia. That congregation merged five years ago with the Plymouth Assembly of God to form United Assembly of God.

"WHEN YOU SEE so closely the work of a pastor and the burden he carries 24 hours a day, you tend to pull away from that kind of responsibility," he said.

"But the Holy Spirit entered my dormitory room."

He explained that after a mission meeting on campus he suddenly found himself thinking seriously about the

ministry. "I opened my Bible," he said, "and found myself reading the third chapter of Ezekiel, in which God tells the prophet he has not sent him to people far away but to his own people, who may be stubborn and rebellious but need to hear his word."

Phil said he changed his major after that experience, and soon was involved in campus activities in that area, being named to coordinate student ministry for some 600 students.

But the idea of working under his father's direction still did not find much favor with a young man determined to be independent. He planned on enrolling in seminary this fall.

However, after he and Becky were married, they kept thinking about their future plans and, as he put it, "the young people of this church kept coming before us."

"There were needs there, and no one was filling them," he explained.

So the son returned to the father to tell him he would like to share his ministry for the coming year.

HOW DID Pastor David Krist react?

"I feel a father in any profession who sees his son follow in his footsteps has to be complimented," he said. "But it is our belief that the ministry is not a profession you can choose. In that, God has to do the choosing."

He has decided, though, that working with a son should be a successful experience.

"A couple of fellow pastors have told me their sons have been their best assistants," he said.

"I have always admired my father's work, and I intend to learn as much as I can," he stated. "Even if he were not my father, I would have picked him for a role model."

While David Krist will continue to do most of the preaching and ministry to adults and Philip will be involved mainly with young people and children, there are some parts of the United Assembly of God program they will share. One is the daily 15-minute broadcast from the pastor's study on WYFC-AM in Ypsilanti.

"It's called 'Moments of Meditation' and I have been doing it for two years," the senior pastor said. "Now we'll work in some dialogue, and Phil will take over on his own some days."

The younger Krist, who plans to head next year for Fuller Theological Seminary at Pasadena, has more than one family ministerial example to follow.

Both his grandfathers are Assemblies of God ministers too.

The Rev. Harvey Krist is retired from the Ypsilanti Assemblies of God and now is an elder at United, teaching occasional Bible classes. And David's wife, Shirley, is the daughter of the Rev. Everett Cooley, the denomination's former district superintendent for Michigan.

"The important thing about a ministerial team is that the two feel their work in the same way. That's more possible for a father and son."

Phil Krist agrees, and says further that he expects to learn a lot in the coming year.

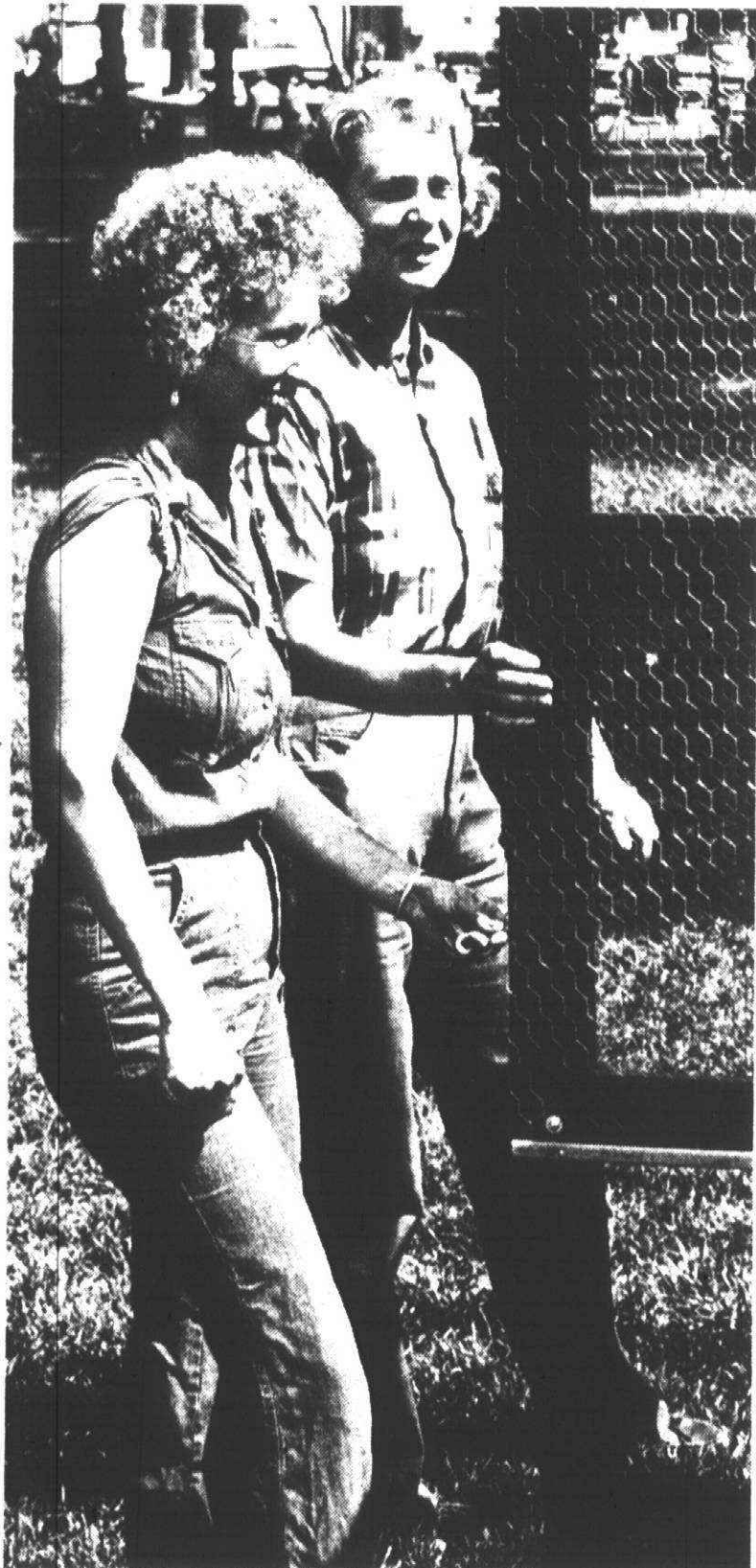
