## Canton road repairs rest with gas and weight tax bills

Canton's cut of a proposed statewide raise in road and mass transportation funding may turn out to be as big a compromise as the bills now before the Michigan State Senate.

The proposals, recently passed by a narrow margin in the state house of representatives, call for an increase in gas and weight taxes as well as a change in distribution of some sales tax.

They represent an attempt to balance the interests of mass transit proponents (notably the City of Detroit) and the interests of those who primarily travel on roads, such as suburbanites.

If passed by the Senate, the bills would mean that the state's counties, cities and public transportation authorities will get an increase of about 25.6 per cent above what is allotted them now.

There would be more compromises, however, before Canton Township

roads would feel the impact of the additional money.

Township roads are the responsibility of county road commissions. Although Wayne County can expect at least \$7 million more under the new provisions should they be approved, Canton will have to stand in line with nine other Wayne County townships for road services.

Canton's state representative, Thomas Brown, was one of the few area suburban legislators to vote in favor of the transportation package.

BROWN INTRODUCED a portion of the package. One of his bills called for not less than 23.8 per cent of the unearmarked portion of the sales tax on gasoline, motor vehicles and motor vehicle parts to be designated to the transportation fund for the 1977-78 fiscal year. The percentage will rise to 26.5 per cent by the 1980-81 fiscal year. The yearly increases would help fund the small bus incentive program and

amount to about \$4.4 million. The bill would mean an extra 20.9 million in the first year.

Two other major fund increases, not sponsored by Brown, would come from a gas tax bill providing a two cent per gallon hike in gas and diesel fuel taxes, (now nine cents for gas and seven cents for diesel fuel) which would generate an extra \$96.5 million.

Another bill provides for an increase in the personal passenger weight tax by an average of 30 per cent and the commercial weight tax by an average of 34 per cent. Other vehicle weight taxes would also rise. The increases combined would bring in about \$50.4 million more.

Brown also sponsored a bill in the transportation package that would establish new distribution percentages, expenditure procedures and bonding processes. The bill would create a separate fund for the state transportation department.

Of that fund, 46.7 per cent would go to the state transportation department, 34.3 per cent to the county road commissions and 19 per cent to cities and villages.

Money going to the state fund would be divided, with 82.22 per cent going for the cost of state highways and 17.78 going for mass transportation programs.

A bridge program would get \$5 million (\$1 million is now allotted) from the transportation fund.

Voters will be asked to approve a constitutional amendment to change the structure of the highway department on the general election ballot if all goes well for the bill in the Senate. They will not vote on the actual tax rates.

Brown says he "hasn't had any really negative reactions," toward his position favoring the proposed package.

Some of the representatives voting against the bills said too much money will be going to fund mass transporta-

tion in Detroit. Brown comments "I think we should accept that \$107 million will be going to roads and streets."

"The critical bridge program has also been expanded," he continues. "Several bridges in the area have been repaired or replaced since the program began with \$1 million in 1972. With the additional funds, it will be easier to come up with matching funds for federal grants."

Brown says the bills would also provide more funding for local dial-a-ride bus systems for senior citizens.

Brown says it is more likely that the road commission will be able to complete such Canton projects as a Ford Road widening and Haggerty Road paving, if the package passes.

He points out that the bills mandate that at least four per cent of the total amount allotted to county road commissions would have to be returned to local road systems. (Canton has both county and local roads, although the commission is responsible for both.)

Canton's state senator, William Faust, will eventually have to vote on the issue, but had not taken a stand as of yet.

He said Tuesday that he would be meeting with other suburban legislators to discuss the bills.

According to a Wayne County Road Commission representative, projects that will probably be instituted if the bills pass include reconstruction on the Sheldon Center connection, on Warren and on Haggerty roads, as well as resurfacing on various paved roads such as Joy and Canton Center.

The representative says Canton residents are not being slighted when it comes to road work, even without the package. According to commission figures from 1976, which were released last October, gas and weight taxes from Canton residents amounted to \$472,384 for that year. The road commission spent \$1,896,305 on Canton roads and services during the same period of time.

## Hoben to send letter of interest in Livonia school

Another step will soon be taken by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education in locating a Livonia school for sale, but administrators say they are not in a rush to finalize any deal.

The board directed Supt. John Hoben to write a letter to Livonia Supt. George Garver expressing interest in a deal. But board members also told him to indicate they are "just probing and are in no way committing themselves to anything."

The Plymouth-Canton district, with its swelling enrollment, has been looking for other facilities to accommodate the extra students.

The Livonia district, with declining enrollments, has been the prime interest area.

"We are just in the talking stage right now," Hoben says. "I'll write the letter sometime next week."

Hoben explained that the real crunch in the number of students will not come until 1980 or 1981. But at the same time, he told the board that the Livonia board doesn't think Plymouth-Canton officials are serious, and that it was necessary to "give them something to sink their teeth into."

The Plymouth-Canton board discussed three Livonia schools, including Lowell Junior High, Washington Elementary and Webster Elementary. Lowell is not available now, but Hoben says there is a possibility that it will be in the next few years.

Garver says members of the Livonia Citizen Task Force—who recommend the schools be closed—may change their mind and elect to close Lowell if a firm offer of use is received.

"But there are two things in the way," he admits. The first of these is that Lowell is located in the middle of a large piece of undeveloped property. If it is developed, as Westland says it will be, Livonia will need the school, Garver says.

The second consideration is that it is a relatively isolated school with no other junior high in the area.

## Development rights query to request four more mills

Voters will be asked to approve the levying of up to four mills for a Canton Township development rights purchase program on the November general election ballot.

The ballot question won't say "up to four mills", however, although that's what is really meant.

Canton's township attorney Bert Burgoyne told the board of trustees that the township would have to hold elections each time the development rights millage was raised if it chose to start with levying one mill and then gradually decided to increase the tax.

If the township board asks for four mills, it doesn't have to levy the entire amount.

The problem, said political candidates and residents in the audience, is that asking for an entire four mills is

bound to make the proposal a sure failure at the polls.

Their protests drew support from trustee Lynn Goldsmith. "I think you're guaranteeing defeat at four mills," she said.

Ms. Goldsmith suggested the words "up to" be inserted in the ballot question in an effort to make voters aware that the entire amount may not be necessary.

But, according to the attorney, just because you mean "up to" doesn't mean you can say it legally.

Burgoyne also told the board that he thought the full four mills would eventually be necessary if the township intends to carry through with a program to retain agricultural lands by purchasing development rights to them.

The program is estimated to cost

some \$16 million dollars.

Millage for land development rights purchase would be levied for 20 years.

Officials now believe that it may not be necessary to levy more than three and one-half mills for the program.

But Burgoyne cautioned the board, "It always costs more than it seems."

Although the board voted unanimously to accept the question asking for four mills, political hopefuls in the November general election are saying some members of the board want to see the development millage voted down.

Both treasurer candidate Jim Donahue (a Republican) and supervisor Democratic candidate Noel Culbert claim that present supervisor Harold Stein is promoting the four-mill question because he wants to see it defeated.

## Hunt continues for rattlesnake

A poisonous snake that bit a 4-year-old boy last Friday will be the target of another search near the Fellows Creek apartment complex this week.

The snake—believed to be a rattler—bit Darold Hocking on the thigh while he was playing behind his home in the apartment complex south of Ford and west of Sheldon.

The boy was rushed to Children's Hospital in Detroit where he was listed in satisfactory condition on Monday.

Two unsuccessful searches for the snake were conducted by apartment residents, the Canton Police Department and the Canton Fire Department last weekend.

The search was requested by doctors at Children's Hospital who wanted to know what type of anti-venom serum to prepare for the boy.

Although the four-year-old is now recovering, Canton animal control officer John Swalley plans to organize a team of volunteers this week to search for the snake in the weeds lining Fellows Creek.

If the snake is found, Swalley said he will move the reptile to the Nankin Mills Nature Center in Westland.

"I just want to get it out of the area," he said.

THE BOY'S MOTHER, Brenda Hocking, said her son was playing alone in a pile of dirt near their apartment when she heard the child scream.

Mrs. Hocking said she looked out the window and saw Darold collapse near some playground equipment. Another child carried the 4-year-old home.

The boy's mother said she thought her son had been stung by a bee. Darold is allergic to bee stings, so Mrs. Hocking immediately telephoned a physician from a neighbor's apartment.

When she returned, the swelling on Darold's thigh had increased tremendously.

"Darold kept saying it was a snake, but I thought he was totally insane," Mrs. Hocking said. "I had never heard of poisonous snakes in Michigan."

The child was unable to describe the snake that bit him near the creek that runs behind the apartment complex.

BUT ACCORDING to Kathy Latinen, assistant curator of the reptile house at the Detroit Zoo, the only poisonous snake native to Michigan is the massasauga rattlesnake, commonly known as the Michigan rattler.

The brownish-black snake usually measures less than 18 inches in length and shakes the rattle characteristic of its species before striking. The massasauga rattlesnake likes wet and marshy areas, but Ms. Latinen says the snake can be found anywhere.

"With development, it's being flushed from its home sites," she said.

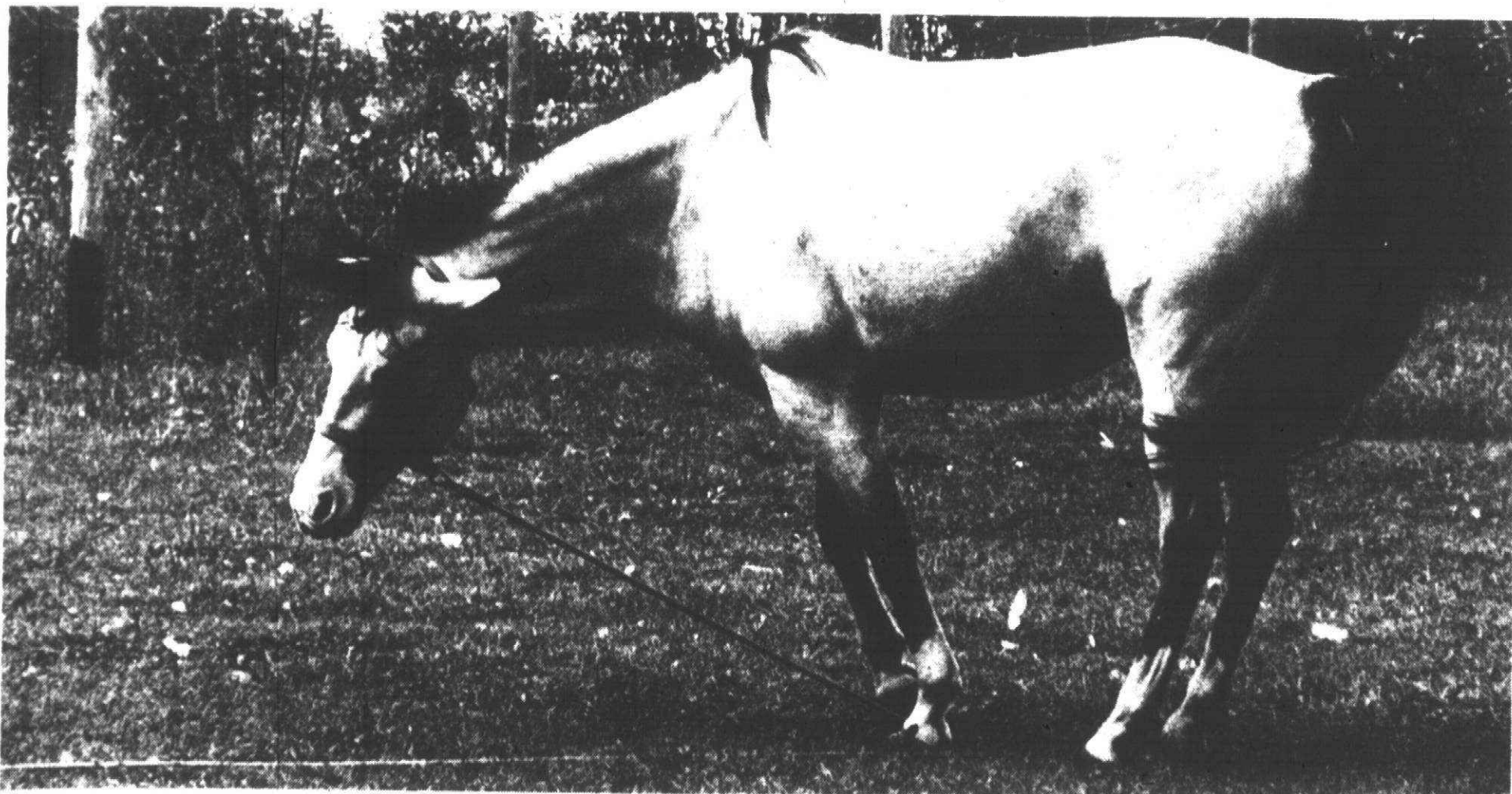
According to Ms. Latinen, the rattler will strike humans only when provoked. Although she termed the snake "very venomous," Ms. Latinen said no case of human death from the rattler's bite has ever been recorded in Michigan.

Swalley said no one in Canton Township has ever been bitten by a rattler in his eight years as animal control officer.

But such statistics aren't easing Mrs. Hocking's mind.

She's afraid that other rattlers are lurking in the weeds along Fellows Creek where children who live in the apartment complex often play.

"Darold says he wants to come home and kill that snake," the boy's mother said. "That's what I'm afraid of."

Democrat wins legal campaign  
to face Pursell in House race

Democrat Earl Greene of Ann Arbor has won his legal campaign to win a place on the Nov. 7 election for the 2d congressional district seat now held by U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, Plymouth Republican.

Greene announced Wednesday that the Michigan Court of Appeals has told his attorney that the court agreed with the candidate's legal argument.

The latest legal fight began Aug. 29 when the Michigan Board of Canvassers refused to certify Greene's write-in votes cast in the Aug. 8 primary for the fall general election.

The court ruling is expected to be filed today, Thursday, Greene said. The Democrat, an Ann Arbor city

councilman, said that he will step up his campaign to beat Pursell, who won the seat by 350 votes over Democrat Edward Pierce nearly two years ago.

Greene, who is a Willow Run High School music teacher, criticized Pursell for his anti-labor voting record and absenteeism.

The Democrat claimed that Pursell missed nearly one-third of the House sessions in 1977 and voted against the Humphrey-Hawkins employment bill and the increase of the minimum wage to \$2.65 per hour.

THE BIGGEST problem with Pursell, said Greene, is that the Republi-

cans doesn't have a philosophy and that his voting record seems to "wane and move where the pressure is."

Greene claimed that Pursell has moved from being a moderate Republican to being a (Ronald) "Reagan-type."

The Democrat also said that Pursell can't deliver on services to the district, which includes Livonia and Plymouth in Wayne County and parts of Washtenaw and Monroe Counties, because he is in the minority party while the majority party controls Congress, the White House and Washington.

On the court of appeals ruling, Greene said that the basic issue was

merely one of fairness and giving voters a chance between two candidates.

Without the court ruling, Pursell would have been unopposed in the fall and Greene would have been forced to mount a massive write-in campaign.

Greene also said that he was denied a spot on the ballot by the state canvassing board despite a ruling by Michigan Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley which said that Greene could be nominated in the primary by getting a majority of the write-in votes cast.

The Democrat had earlier problems getting on the primary ballot because of flaws in his nominating petitions.

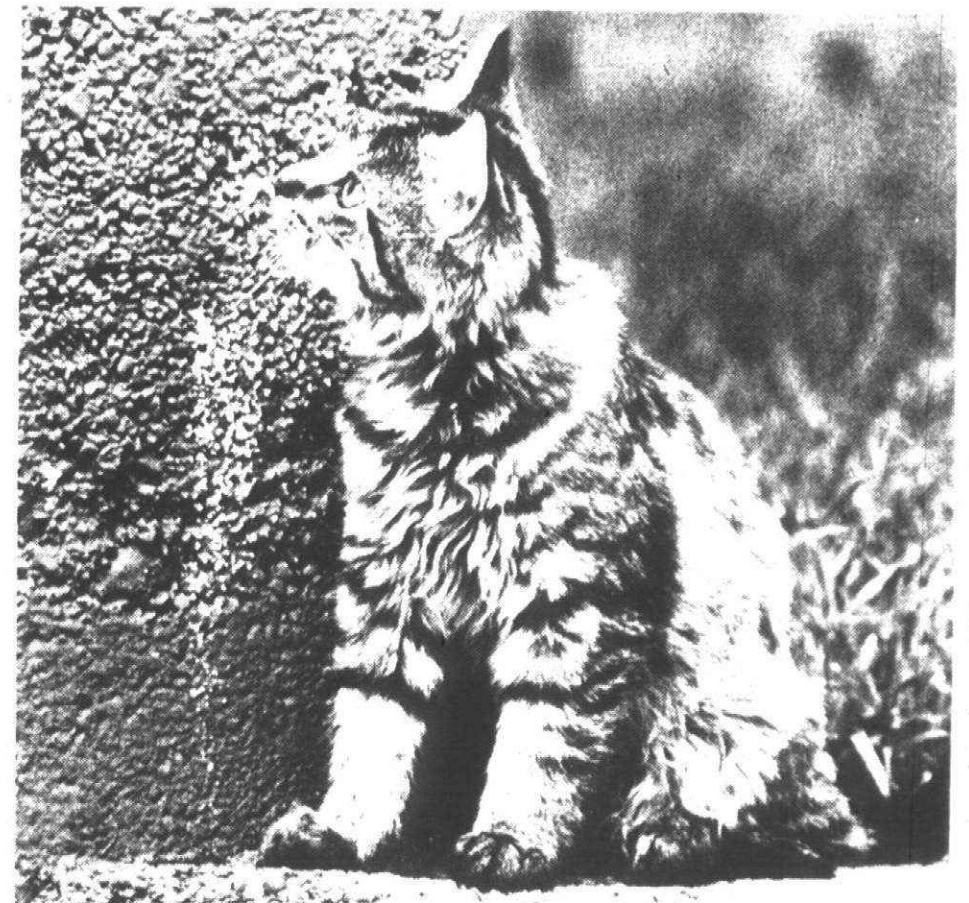

# Clinic will offer range of services

How much do you really know about birth control? Could you recognize the symptoms of venereal disease? How often should a woman have a pelvic examination?

The answers to these and other health questions can be answered at a family planning and health clinic for adults and teens which opened this week in Westland. Located at 32633 Cherry Hill, the clinic serves the western Wayne County suburbs.

"Most women don't know their body," said Donna Kasabach, a nurse-practitioner who heads the program. "There is a taboo on sexuality and the

body is considered dirty."

The clinic is sponsored by Communities United for Action, Inc., a social service agency headquartered in Taylor which provides community services to out-Wayne County cities.

Funding for the clinic comes from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, through a Southeastern Michigan family planning project. Patients are charged according to ability to pay.

Services offered include testing and counseling, which are performed by nurse-practitioners (trained and certified to do medical tests), aides and

counselors. The range of services, which are confidential, includes:

- Pregnancy testing.
- Birth control counseling and supplies.
- Breast and pelvic examinations.
- Blood test for venereal disease.
- Hemoglobin and diabetes testing.

The clinic also holds rap sessions for both teens (under 18) and adults.

Both groups, which are open to both men and women, discuss the responsibilities of sexuality. By dividing discussions by age groups, the clients can have frank talks with their peers.

"We deal with sex in the real world, as opposed to some abstract, sensual way," said Charles Smith, a CUFA public information officer.

"Sexuality is really pushed in our society," he added. "It's distressing because it has a rippling effect on other areas of society."

The "rippling effect" includes unwanted pregnancy, teen marriages and venereal disease.

For instance, Wayne County Health Department statistics from 1975 show that teens account for 36 per cent of out-of-wedlock births in suburban Wayne County.

Ms. Kasabach hopes to stress the importance of education as a deterrent to unwanted pregnancy and venereal disease.

"Only 33 per cent of female gonorrhea victims have symptoms," said Ms. Kasabach.

"I think that lack of information is the biggest problem," she added.

Ms. Kasabach emphasized that clinic services are confidential. Hours are from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Tuesdays, and from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturdays. For further information, or to make an appointment, call 729-8990.

## Legislation could hike cost of transit system

Pending federal legislation could cost Garden City an additional \$9,000 to support the Nankin Transit Commission from January to June, 1979.

"I don't want to sound like it's doomday for Nankin Transit," said NTC Chairman Glenn Shaw. "I think we're providing a service that people recognize, and I think they'll support it."

Changes in the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) now, under consideration in Congress would put a \$12,000 cap on wages to CETA employees and establish a maximum 18-month employment limit.

CETA-paid NTC drivers now earn more than \$12,000.

"I think I could work around that by cutting back the work week and hiring

more employees," said Shaw.

The 18-month limit, however, has Shaw stumped. If it's approved, it could mean immediate termination for those NTC staff who have already worked 18 months. Other NTC staff are approaching that potential cut-off date.

Other legislation, however, could bail the "dial-a-ride" program out of the finance mess. Shaw said a bill expected to come to a vote soon in the Michigan legislature would provide the NTC with its entire budget through SEMTA. The bill would also tag an extra two cents tax on every gallon of gasoline sold in Michigan.

If funds are needed, however, Westland will owe \$18,892, Garden City \$9,118, Inkster \$8,405, and Wayne \$4,583. All figures are based on percentage of population.

## Drag meet scheduled for coming weekend

Region K Jaycees will host their fourth annual fall high school drag meet Saturday, Sept. 30, at Milan Dragway.

The dragstrip opens at 12:30 p.m. with an orientation set for 1:15. Practice runs are scheduled from 1:30-4 p.m. with trophy runs slated for 4:30. Trophy and awards presentation will take place at 5:45.

The competition is open to all high school students in Wayne County. Region K Jaycees include all local chapters in the county. Each student must have a Michigan drivers license and a 1978-79 high school identification card. Any car, truck, van or motorcycle may be entered after passing a vehicle safety inspection.

For four-wheel vehicles, the inspection includes tread on all tires (except slicks), brakes and safety belts. Motorcyclists must have tread on tires, helmet, leather jacket, heavy duty shoes or boots and gloves.

The competition will be divided into six divisions—four brackets for four-wheel vehicles, one bracket for motorcycles and one bracket for girls. Bracket racing allows all competitors an equal chance by giving a slower vehicle a head start based on the difference between two vehicles average time in a quarter mile.

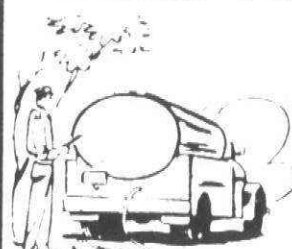

# The Stroller

## Ali and Father Time

If he really is smart—and no one ever has accused him of being dumb—Muhammad Ali will retire from the prize ring and rest on his laurels.

He sort of sneered at Old Father Time the other evening when he out-pointed Leon Spinks in the spacious arena in New Orleans to become the only man ever to win the world heavyweight championship three times. But you can't sneer at the old man with the scythe too often.

As he sat there watching the one-sided battle on the tube, The Stroller, who has been around the fight game for more than a half-century, noticed that Ali didn't "float around like a butterfly," and his jabs didn't "sting like a bee"—the champion's own description of his style. It was a sign that Father Time was catching up with him.

OVER THE YEARS, The Stroller has witnessed the drama of famous athletes coming to the end of the road. It always is an emotional scene.

There was the time when Jack Dempsey, one of the most popular of all champions, was on the verge of traveling the comeback trail after losing his title to Gene Tunney.

To test himself, Dempsey accepted an exhibition bout in Flint. The day after the bout, he walked into the late Harry Tuttle's old gym on Monroe Avenue in downtown Detroit. Spotting The Stroller, Dempsey walked over to him, opened his bag, took out a pair of boxing gloves and asked him to hang them on the wall.

"I always promised you a good story," he said, "and here it is. Hang them up. I'm all finished."

Once the gloves were on the wall, Dempsey explained that he realized there was no sense in his carrying on. "I can hit just as hard as ever, but my legs are gone. I can see openings, but can't move in fast enough to take advantage of them. And I can see punches coming, but my legs won't let me move fast enough to duck them. When that happens, it's time to quit." And he did.

YEARS LATER, when Joe Louis, the famed Brown Bomber, was reaching the end of the trail, he made the mistake of sneering at Father Time and paid dearly for it.

He was knocked out by Rocky Marciano in Madison Square Garden in New York City. There never was a more pitiful sight than seeing Joe lying on the ring apron being counted out. It was the end of a most fabulous career.

Prior to the fight, Joe had retired undefeated and was talked into staging a comeback against a fellow named Ezzard Charles. Charles beat him on points and took the title. Later, the crown fell into the hands of Marciano, and again Joe was being asked to stage a comeback, to win back the title.

One afternoon he dropped into The Stroller's office in downtown Detroit to visit and re-live some of the great times we had had together while he was climbing the pugilistic ladder from the Golden Gloves to the heavyweight championship of the world.

Two nights before the visit, Joe had boxed an exhibition and was wearing a plaster on his left cheek. It was the first time The Stroller ever had seen him with a cut on his face, and he had

seen Joe in all the championship fights.

WHEN LOUIS revealed he had been asked to fight Marciano, The Stroller warned him to forget about it. He pointed out that he had never seen him suffer more than a bloody nose. Now, he was being cut in exhibition matches.

"That ought to tell you something," The Stroller said. "You are being hit—and cut—by fellows who shouldn't be in the same ring with you."

"But Marciano is a swinger," Louis countered. "I can step inside and get him."

"Don't forget, Joe," The Stroller warned, "your legs aren't what they used to be. Maybe they won't take you in fast enough to duck those swings."

Louis didn't listen. He sneered at Father Time. Now he is paying dearly for it as he sits in a wheelchair at Caesar's Palace in Las Vegas. He is a pitiful sight.

Ali should take his cue from him.

Around here, H&F Day is an entire weekend. Westland Center at Warren and Wayne roads will have 25 exhibits Friday through Sunday.

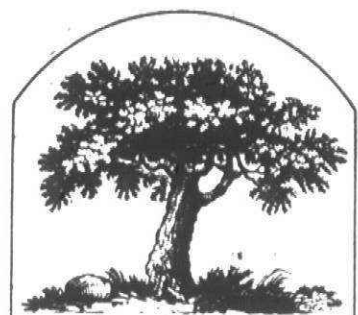
Taking part will be member organizations of Region One of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs. Exhibits will include archery, fly casting and animal lore.

# Both sides hopeful of short strike at SC

As a strike of two unions at Schoolcraft College entered its fourth day, there were speculations—and some evidence—that classes might resume next week.

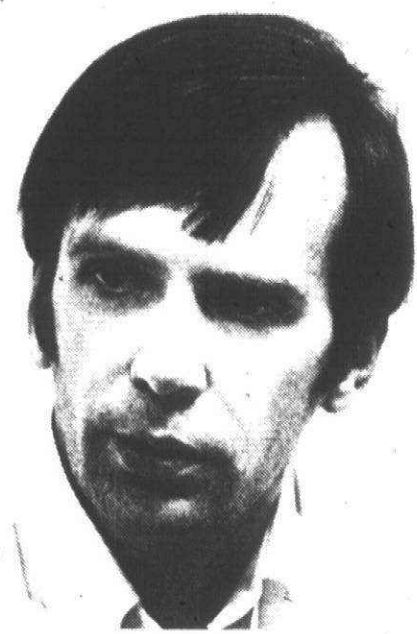
Both union and administration sources were optimistic as some progress was made this week at the bargaining table.

Meanwhile, President C. Nelson Grote announced all special events on campus were cancelled through Sunday. These include a Saturday orientation for part-time faculty, a Saturday workshop on how to start your own business and Friday's dinner-dance of the Schoolcraft College Foundation.

The strongest sign that the strike may be near an end was the announcement that last Monday's scheduled Cole Porter Cabaret program had been re-scheduled to 8 p.m. next Tuesday, Sept. 26. Previously sold tickets will be honored. Those who cannot attend will be able to get refunds at the college bookstore once it reopens.

WILLIAM NICKELS, president of the 350-member Faculty Forum, said "conceptual" agreement had been reached Tuesday on two important issues—the counselors' work year and the status of a reading lab assistant. No details were revealed.

Nickels and Dorothy Irving, president of the 62-member Schoolcraft College Association of Office Personnel (SCAOP), gave the board of trustees,

meeting Tuesday in a special session, their "bottom line" packages. Details were scanty, but one source mentioned an eight per cent economic figure.

The Faculty Forum's bargaining committee met with the board negotiators all Sunday night, eight hours Monday, more than three hours Tuesday, with another session scheduled today.

The secretaries union was to resume bargaining Wednesday for the first time since last weekend.

THREE MAJOR issues still separate the faculty and the college, according to a forum spokesman.

These are length of the work day, health insurance and the remainder of the economic package.

The health insurance question appeared to be the key. The college's position, beginning with other unions a year ago, has been that employees should pick up part of the increasing cost of health insurance. One method would be for employees to pick up 10 per cent of any increases. Another would be an annual deductible of \$25 per person and \$50 per family from benefits.

The unions countered with a proposal that Blue Cross-Blue Shield be dropped as the insurance carrier and two other carriers be substituted—MESSA for medical and Delta for dental. Nickels said this change would require no reduction of benefits and be cheaper for the college.

Once the health insurance question is resolved, the rest of the economic package is expected to fall into place.

The Faculty Forum, as the largest of five campus unions, is expected to set the pattern on the health insurance question. A middle management union agreed a year ago to accept whatever the forum negotiated on health insurance this year. SCAOP has worked for 15 months without a contract basically because the health package couldn't be agreed to.

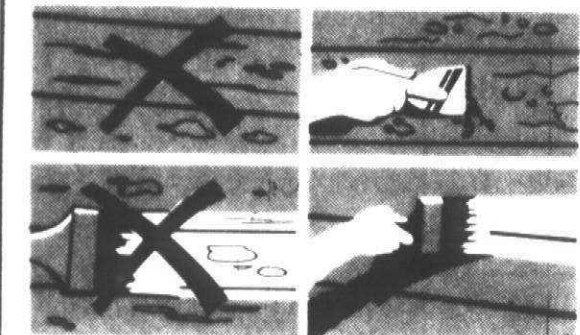
The Faculty Forum, which represents 160 full-time and a similar number of part-time instructors, has been without a contract since Aug. 25. The SCAOP represents 62 clerks and secretaries.

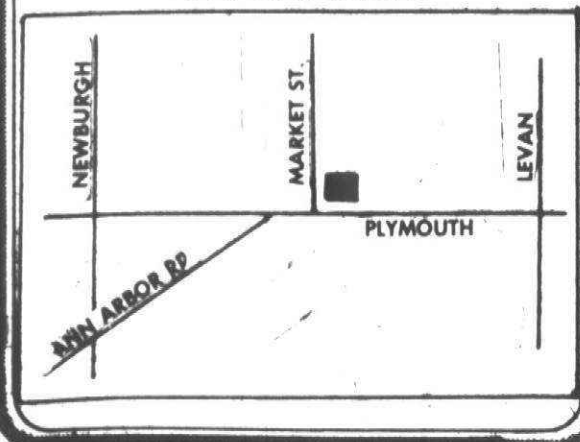

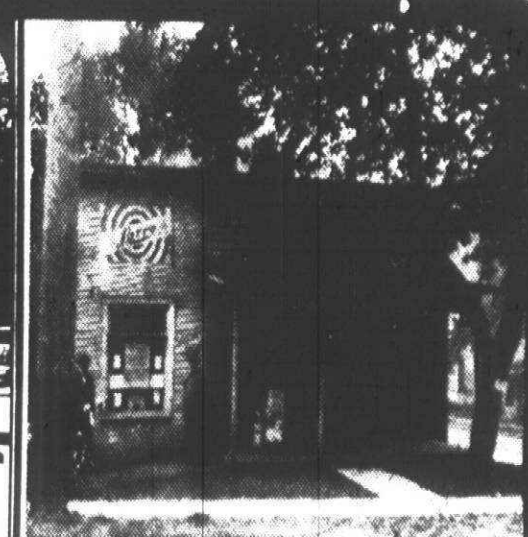

# After 8 inactive years Navy vet returns to duty

Not many men who have undergone the rigors of serving their country in war time have a yearning to return to the stations they once held. Most often they would like to forget and leave the memory of their services to the historians.

Now and then there is an exception. One of these occurred in Plymouth recently when Edwin "Win" Schrader, of the funeral home Schraders, couldn't resist the urge to go back on a destroyer when three of the big Navy boats cruised the Great Lakes on a goodwill tour.

As soon as he heard of their coming, "Win," who was a lieutenant on the USS Hopewell and served 17 months off the coast of Vietnam during the war, yearned to get back to the station.

As he put it, he yearned for the

peculiar smell of the bridge on the destroyer and the agony of tired legs after standing on the bridge for hours.

TO SATISFY THE urge, he contacted naval officials and was granted the privilege of going aboard in Detroit and taking a trip to Cleveland, a trip of little more than eight hours.

"It was a very enjoyable experience," he commented later, "and it was a thrill that I never can forget."

He hadn't been on a destroyer for eight years—not since the day he was discharged—and he found that things hadn't changed. He confided that he felt right at home the minute he stepped on deck.

"The old peculiar smell of the bridge was still there and my feet and legs got just as tired and ached as they did when we served off the coast of Vietnam."

"The only thing missing was the salt air."

On board across Lake Erie he talked at length with Capt. James R. Seely, commander of the USS Robert A. Owens, that lead the fleet of three boats around the lakes.

"We had a great time reminiscing and the commander explained that the tour of the lakes was a good will trip to interest new recruits and help build up the finances. The work of the crew was to emphasize recruiting while training for the real work that lay ahead."

ONE OF THE REAL thrills of the trip came when he was told of a happening at Buffalo.

Here the crew heard of a young man in need of a wheelchair. It was a pay-day on the destroyer and the crew pitched in \$470 and bought the chair. It was a typical Navy move.

Another pleasant happening on the cruise across the lake came when the Filipino chef, M.T. Cruz MS2, took him to the galley and served him a dish of gilli-gilli.

"I hadn't tasted it since I left the service and it certainly brought back a lot of memories."

"It was a great experience to be back on the bridge of a destroyer living and eating like we did during those trying days off the coast of Vietnam."

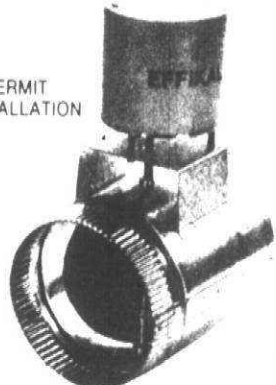

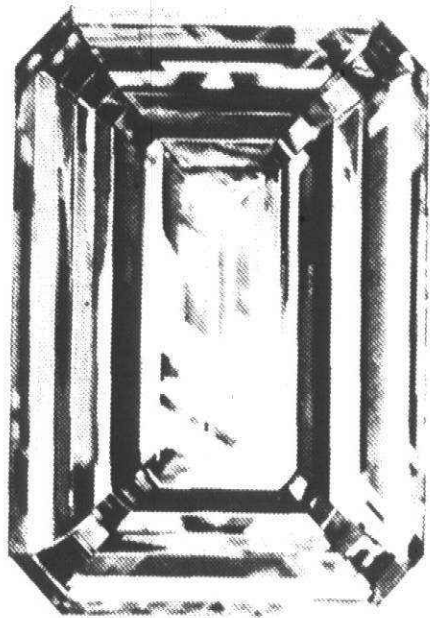

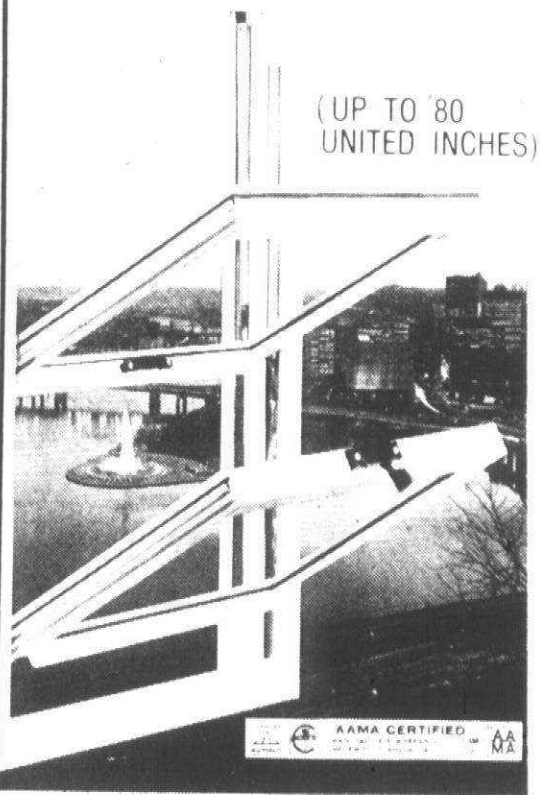

# Is ME sinful?

## A day in year for self-pursuits

If a foreigner ever visited a contemporary American bookstore, he might well conclude our nation sick—sick socially, politically, physically, psychologically and sick spiritually.

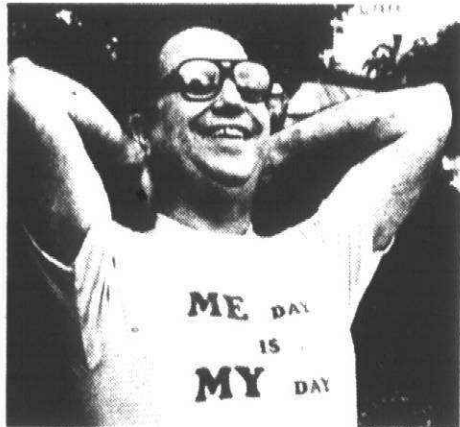
The plethora of self-help books expound a bewildering and often contradictory assortment of theories, approaches, methods and techniques to achieve better mental and physical health, success in business, social relationships and careers, success in marriage and child rearing, success in school and even success in beating the "system."

WHAT UNDERLIES THE voracious appetite of Americans for self-help books? Is it an effort to get more meaning out of the one life we have?

Yes, I suppose that may be at least a partial answer. But there also is an element of death defiance inherent in self-help too. If I take my vitamins, nutritional food, exercises, beauty aids, see my doctor, dentist, lawyer and psychiatrist every six months, drink eight glasses of water, six glasses of milk, lay off beer, cigarettes, eggs and fatty foods, etc. maybe, just maybe, I can fool the Grim Reaper. When he comes for me and sees what fine shape I'm in, he will conclude I can't possibly be the one he should escort to that "other" place.

The problem with most self-help books is that while they keep you busy nursing yourself, you are missing out on the fun of the only life you will ever have. Self-help books, even those written by humanists, make us feel inadequate. We wouldn't even buy them unless we felt inadequate in some way.

Are we too fat, too shy, too indecisive, too sensitive, too tired, too

poor, too bored, too clumsy, too nervous, too awkward socially? If so, there is a book to cover that feeling. (More likely, there are a dozen books.)

YOU SEE, they all start from a premise that something is wrong with you.

You are missing an element in life that the author intends to straighten out because he or she is an "expert" and you are dumb. A little new information, insight of self-analysis is all you need to grow rich, get smart or grow svelte.

Getting you "hooked" on feelings of inadequacy is what self-help books are all about. Do you know anyone who was cured of anything by reading just one self-help book? One book can only whet your appetite. Next week a better one will be on the stands. It will do even more or at least promise more.

But if you read them all, where would you be? What would you have? All you have is other people's opinions about what you should do with your life, your body and your mind, while the real question goes begging.

"How can I lead my life according to my own dictates, not the dictates of others, be they parents, spouses,

bosses, friends, relatives, teachers, gurus or experts who write self-help books."

Do I always have to please others? Is it sinful to please myself, act in my own best interest, enjoy myself for what I am and not for what I should become or should have been?

Why can't I be satisfied with knowing I am me, a fascinating, intrepid, lovable and capable human being? Why can't I say, "Today, I am the best possible person I could have ever been."

OUR INNATE DRIVE for success, achievement and winning at everything, needs to be periodically reconsidered and challenged.

Why is success so important? Who said we must succeed? Is it our choice? What is success anyway? Who can describe it for me? Who is successful? Did it bring him happiness or peace of mind or friendships? Is success always something that happens to other people? Can it happen to me?

Success seems to be the "bitch-goddess" of all Americans. She weights herself on our backs and provides no relief.

What I propose is a psychology of failure. Let yourself go. Give yourself a breather once a month. Take a failure break. Proclaim that day as ME day. Make "ME day is My day" your motto. Make your ME day a day of creative chaos. Don't listen to anyone but yourself that day. Don't respond to any outside force or stimulus.

With everyone pulling, tugging, pushing and shoving you around, you owe it to yourself to be judgmental, hostile and critical of the success advocates on ME day. See what it feels like to get off the treadmill, to be truly shiftless, immobile, fixed, rigid and uncontrolled by others.

Be lazy, slow moving and uncon-

templative. Relax your mind, body and spirit. If you like to sleep, sleep more. If you like to eat, eat more. If TV is your bag, take a full 12-hour shot. If fishing is your thing, do a day of it.

THE REASON WE feel miserable in an affluent society is that we have forgotten what poverty, spiritual bankruptcy and poor health feel like.

Our preoccupation with success takes up all our time and clouds our vision. I'm not suggesting a drop-out philosophy. Just drop-out for a day every month on your ME day.

Very soon I will do a "no-help" book on the psychology of failure. It will be written on my ME days, so it may take a long time.

My book will be different. It won't cost you a cent. I'll publish it myself so I won't have to bother with editor's blue pencils either. (No one is going to tell me how to write a book on my ME days.)

After reading it, send any amount that suits your fancy. If you think it's worthless, don't send anything but your caustic comments. Don't send any more than \$1 either. I won't accept it.

The title? How about, "The No-Help Self-Help Book: A Manual of Creative Chaos for People Who Want to Leave Well Enough Alone One Day a Month."

What I truly need are your suggestions about what people can do on their ME days to break out of the success rut. Give me your therapeutic answers and I will include them in my book. It will save me time on my ME days: time to do something better than writing: doing nothing but listening to myself.

# Roman ruins replaces Carthage's

At a beach resort on the north coast of Africa in April 1977, we were not far from the hometown of the military genius who scared the pants off the Romans more than 2,000 years ago.

As a history buff, I could not pass up an opportunity like this. So we spent a day in Carthage, just north of Tunis. It is across a narrow part of the Mediterranean from Sicily, the island which Carthage and Rome often wrangled over.

**TUNISIA TODAY** IS primarily an Arabic world, with Arabic as the nation's official language.

Arabians moved in long after Hannibal's time, and it is their culture which has prevailed. Hence, the sights we saw from our bus window on the way to Carthage from Hammamet, where we were staying, were largely Arabic in origin.

Men wearing red fezzes; women shielding their faces by holding the points of their cache-pousseries (dust coats) between their teeth; lone camels grazing like cattle in the fields; row on row of fences made of cactus; tiny donkeys bearing men and loads double their size; tourists bobbing self-consciously astride haughty-looking camels, egged on by over-coated camel drivers; elegantly-domed and minareted mosques—all of these held our attention as the bus made its way to and through Tunis and then north to our destination.

We knew we were on the right track when we passed an eating place called Restaurant Hannibal.

It was not bad-looking, but hardly a fitting reminder of the brilliant strategist who led his army and a line of colossal elephants, like moving fortresses, through Spain, across France, and over the mountains into southern Italy. There, on the plain at Cannae, Hannibal annihilated one of the largest armies ever assembled.

Eleven years later, Hannibal and his veteran army were still in the extreme

south of Italy. Then his brother, Hasdrubal, who was marching to reinforce him, was defeated and killed by the Romans at the Metaurus. They cut off his head and had it thrown into Hannibal's camp.

I was thinking of what a shock that must have been to the great Carthaginian general, when our guide announced that we were turning toward the sea to view the remains of the city where he lived. The crossroads at which we turned is called Shell and Esso.

**BEFORE WE ARRIVED** at the ruins, we had seen enough of modern Carthage to realize that it is now primarily a suburb of middle-class villas owned by people who commute to Tunis.

The splendor of the mighty city which challenged the Roman Empire for dominance of the Mediterranean is nowhere to be seen—not even in its ruins.

After annexing Cannae by defeating Hannibal at Zama in North Africa, the Roman general Scipio had every building in Carthage razed. At one blow, the city was destroyed. The land was ploughed and salted so nothing would grow. A curse was pronounced upon the site.

Later, the Romans forgot about this curse and rebuilt the city, so the ruins we see today are of Roman, not Carthaginian origin. Still later, Carthage fell into neglect under the Arabs, and European collectors in the 19th Century helped further the destruction of what was left.

Today, Tunisian archaeologists have put many of the remaining artifacts in museums to protect them from further vandalism.

The sites are scattered and isolated.

Our tour concentrated on the Baths of Antoninus. Lying along the shore of the Mediterranean, these Roman ruins are what is left of the basement of the baths built by Hadrian in the second century. If you have seen the ruins of Roman baths elsewhere, you will probably find these of only mild interest.

In the distance, beyond the excavation wall, you can see the palace of Tunisian President Habib Bourguiba, who reportedly said that "if ever Tunisia strikes oil wealth, the bourgeois villas will be removed and Carthage restored to its former self."

## Justice to discuss role of state high court

The function and operation of the state's highest court will be discussed by Michigan Supreme Court Justice James L. Ryan at the Plymouth Rotary Club noon meeting Friday.

The court best serves the people of the state when it confines its function to clarifying existing laws and not creating new ones, he says.

"The decisions of our Supreme Court are reached in virtual secrecy, for our deliberations are all conducted in private. We do not have the benefit of broad public discussion and debate," he says. "However, that is just as it should be, for our business is not to discover and enact the public will. That is the work of the legislature."

The mission of the court is rather to "discover what the law is, to declare it in a straightforward, understandable manner and to apply it to the factual situation before the court," says Ryan. While there must be growth in the law in our changing society, judges must

Unfortunately, though he may be able to refurbish the Roman ruins he cannot bring back anything of the city founded by the Carthaginians.

**IF YOU FEEL** let down by what is left (or not left) at Carthage, you can revive your spirits by going to nearby Sidi Bou Said and sampling the national drink—a dark, sweet tea laced with mint.

Built on a lofty cliff, which early navigators used as a landmark, Sidi Bou Said is a picturesque Tunisian village of cobbled streets and blue and white buildings. It is now a colony of writers, artists and of people who have lots more money than you or I.

The Aga Khan is said to have been refused permission recently to buy up half of Sidi Bou Said for use as a millionaires' holiday retreat.

# Summary begins on 11 ballot issues

(Prepared by the League of Women Voters, Troy)

This Nov. 7, Michigan voters will decide the fates of 11 ballot proposals concerning diverse issues.

Although these have been placed on the ballot by different methods, they all serve the same objective: To provide the people a direct voice, through popular vote, in creating a new law, changing an existing one or amending the state constitution.

A proposal may be placed on the ballot by a mandate of the constitution, by the legislature or by a petition drive.

This year, one ballot proposal was mandated by the constitution itself. Adopted in 1963, the constitution mandates that a proposal be put on the ballot every 16 years to decide whether a state constitutional convention should be held.

THE STATE legislature may also place a proposal on the ballot by passing a joint resolution by a two-thirds vote of both houses.

A joint resolution may propose an addition or change in the state constitution or the enactment of a law on an issue on which the legislature is unwilling to act without voter approval. It must be submitted at least 60 days before the next general election.

This year, four joint resolutions were passed: The denial of bail to "career criminals"; the deposit of state funds in savings and loan associations and credit unions; the establishment of a Railroad Development Authority; and the diversion of motor vehicle and fuel taxes for comprehensive transportation purposes and the consequent change of the State

Highway Department to the Transportation Department.

THE MOST common way for a proposal to get on the ballot is through a petition drive.

There are three kinds of petitions: An initiative petition; a referendum petition and a constitutional revision petition.

An initiative petition proposes to enact a new law or change or reject a law enacted by a previous initiative petition. The proposal regarding the limitation of parole for convicted felons is the result of an initiative petition.

An initiative petition must have enough signatures to equal eight per cent of the total votes for all candidates for governor in the previous general election (212,562), and it must be filed with the secretary of state not less than 10 days before the beginning of a session of the legislature prior to the election in which it would be voted upon.

A referendum petition proposes to approve or reject a law already enacted by the legislature. It must have signatures equaling five per cent of the total gubernatorial votes in the previous general election (132,851) and be presented within 90 days after the final adjournment of a legislative session prior to the election. This year, no ballot proposals were placed on the ballot in this manner.

A CONSTITUTIONAL revision petition proposes to amend the constitution by adding a new provision or deleting a current one.

The proposals concerning raising the legal drinking age to 21, collective bar-

gaining by state police troopers, the Headlee tax limitation plan, the tuition voucher plan, and the Tsch property tax cut are the results of constitutional revision petitions.

This type of petition requires signatures equal to 10 per cent (265,702) of the total gubernatorial votes cast in the previous general election, and it must be filed at least 120 days before the election at which they are to be voted upon.

Signatures of all petitions must be certified by the Michigan State Board of Canvassers.

A BALLOT proposal may include a date on which it becomes effective, if passed.

If a proposal passes and doesn't have such a date, and if the proposal creates a new law, the law is effective

10 days after the date of the official declaration of the vote.

A constitutional amendment, if passed, becomes effective 45 days after the date of the election at which it was approved.

A law enacted by initiative petition may be changed or repealed by another vote of the people, a provision in the original petition providing for change or repeal, or by a three-fourths vote in each house of the legislature.

A law enacted by a referendum petition can be amended by the legislature during any subsequent session. The governor cannot veto a law created as a result of an approved petition because the constitution prohibits this.

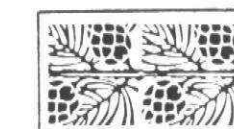

# Abstraction of mining region

## SC's 1st sculpture on campus is 'Pocohontas'

"Pocohontas," Schoolcraft College's first piece of campus sculpture doesn't look much like a willowy Indian maiden.

That's because it's an abstraction representing the coal mining environ-

ment of West Virginia, where the Pocohontas brand of coal is extracted from the earth.

The work is by John W. Chaffee, who designed and assembled most of it in his Nine Mile Road studio in Novi.

Chaffee recently closed it down to move to New York City.

The idea came from Chaffee and Richard Saunders, the college's assistant dean of arts and sciences. Financing came from an \$1,800 gift from the Louise Thayer Bryan endowment fund.

Cor-ten steel was provided by the Detroit chapter of the American Welding Society.

"Pocohontas" stands on the mall in front of the library on the college's main campus at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia. It was formally unveiled Sept. 13.

Saunders said the title was prompted by Chaffee's "youthful days in West Virginia, where he became familiar with the mining of high quality Pocohontas coal.

"He received his formal education at the University of North Carolina and the Art Students' League, New York. His artistic achievements have received top awards in shows throughout the Midwest.

"Locally, John has received commissions from Mayotte Memorial Chapel, Luke Powers Education Center in Flint, Industrial Smelting Co. of Detroit, and Novi Community School District, where his steel sculpture, 'Near You,' received wide acclaim in The Cultural Post, a publication of the National Endowment for the Arts."

If the topic seems off-beat, consider

that Schoolcraft offers programs in heating and refrigeration technology, metallurgy, welding technology and industrial fabrication.

Some of the metal sculpturing took place in the campus' welding shop, Saunders added.

Chaffee selected the site. Fernon Feenstra, assistant dean in the voc-tech area, got the aid of the American

Welding Society. The endowment fund committee recommended commissioning the work and acted for the college in approving the design and site.

Schoolcraft College was named for Henry Rowe Schoolcraft, the first state geologist and later Indian agent whose writings prompted Henry Wadsworth Longfellow to write "The Song of Hiawatha."

## SC awaits vote on aid

The Michigan House of Representatives is scheduled to vote this week on a community college funding bill that means more than \$4.75 million to Schoolcraft College.

Gov. William G. Milliken vetoed an earlier \$120 million funding bill for Michigan's 29 community colleges, charging it placed too many restrictions on local boards.

The new version, which passed the state senate last week, added \$438,000 to the total pot and removed the restrictions. Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote told the board of trustees last week.

"The community college presidents on Aug. 31 were asked to meet with the governor's staff," Grote said. "The presidents unanimously supported the recommendation and said they would seek the support of their legislators."

"It's one of the few times when there was unanimous support."

Last spring Schoolcraft hoped for \$4.9 million from the state. When the bill finally passed the legislature in July, it had been cut to \$4.725 million. The new bill raises the total to \$4.75 million.

The community college's total budget is about \$11 million. The state funding is subject to adjustment, depending on how many credit hours students enroll for.

## Suburban landscaping neglected

# Jeffries' maintenance cutback angers Manning

If you regularly drive the Jeffries Freeway (I-96) and have noticed that the landscaped embankments are neater in Detroit than in Livonia and Redford Township, you're right.

A state highway department official admitted there is a cutback in the freeway maintenance and that move has angered Wayne County Com-

missioner Richard Manning (D-Redford and Livonia).

Manning dashed off an angry letter to a state highway official demanding more information and a better explanation why the landscaping in the suburban section of the freeway isn't maintained.

The commissioner also said that he is asking for a meeting of federal and state highway officials to determine and clarify the policies for the freeway's maintenance.

Manning also asked the state for a full disclosure of the current grass mowing schedule for I-96 and what has happened to the funds budgeted for this year.

The commissioner also sent copies of his letter to Mayor Edward McNamara of Livonia, Redford Supervisor Patrick McDonald, Michael Berry, county road commission chairman, Borock Adams, U.S. Secretary of Transportation, Peter Fletcher, chairman of the state highway commission, and officials in western Wayne County.

MANNING'S LETTER was prompted by a letter from Robert Perry, district maintenance engineer for the state highway department.

Perry had written Leo Snage, Redford's public services director, that "it

is not the policy of our department to mow the slopes of the expressways where they pass through a city. We have expressways in Lansing, Grand Rapids, Flint and Saginaw that have never been mowed.

"An exception was made some years ago to allow for slope mowing in our area. At that time, the Wayne County Road Commission had sufficient manpower to do the work and our budget would allow the extra mowing to be done.

"However, due to recent budgetary limitations, Wayne County has been reducing the size of its work force and finds it difficult to do the amount of mowing for us that they once did.

"At the same time, the number of miles of expressway to be maintained has been increased while our mowing budget has been reduced."

Perry admitted, in what Manning

described as the "understatement of the year," that the state realizes that the freeway roadides "do not look as good unmowed" but that the department's main responsibility "is to maintain the road surface in as safe a condition as possible."

Perry said that the use of chemical weed sprays "should improve the appearance" of the slopes and "we feel the public will soon become accustomed to the new conditions."

MANNING WROTE that the state policy of not mowing slopes in cities is a surprise to him "and to most citizens to whom ordinary housekeeping is a way of life.

"Let me say that I can't imagine a program for roads, especially freeways, that doesn't contemplate maintaining the roadides in an acceptable condition and up to standards of the local community," he said.

Manning feels that the section of I-96 "now appears to be in such a state of neglect from the Detroit city boundary westward through Livonia and Redford as to be a serious detriment to property values of several miles of homes abutting the right-of-way as well as serious blight to the community."

The commissioner also felt Perry's comments as confusing as to what the state's policy really is.

Manning said that while Perry said the state doesn't mow freeway slopes in cities, an exception is also mentioned.

In pressing Perry for more information, Manning noted that it is apparent that there is freeway slope mowing in Detroit but not west of Detroit.

"The roadides are a weed-filled abomination which are a source of aggravation," Manning said.

## New county ordinance to help small businesses

A seminar for small and minority businesses in western Wayne County will explain a new ordinance adopted by the county board of commissioners and approved by the governor.

The new ordinance, called a set-aside plan, assures that 25 per cent of the county's business will be done with small and minority businesses. Ten per cent of that is earmarked for non-minority small firms.

The ordinance could mean up to \$18 million next year in set-aside contracts. Perhaps as much as \$7 million could be reserved strictly for minority firms which now gets less than one per cent of county business.

The ordinance will be discussed at 10 a.m., Sept. 25 in the 13th floor auditorium in the City-County Building downtown. It will be conducted by the county's nine-member citizen advisory committee on small and minority business.

The ordinance defines a small business as one not dominant in its field, including manufacturing, construction, service and professional concerns. Dollar amounts in the interpretation range from a maximum of \$15 million in gross receipts for manufacturing ventures to \$3 million for some construction businesses.

The term "minority" in the ordinance means persons who are black, Hispanic, American Indian, Asian, Pacific Islander or Alaskan native as defined by federal or state authorities.

The plan is modeled after guidelines in federal public works legislation which requires 10 per cent of public works money to be set aside for minority consideration.

The ordinance also provides that contracts held aside for small and minority firms will be subsequently let to larger firms if small or minority firms cannot meet bid requirements.

## Dismissal set early Oct. 5

High school and middle school students in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools will be dismissed early Thursday, Oct. 5, so that teachers may participate in professional development activities.

Plymouth Salem and Canton high schools will dismiss students at 10:20 a.m.

East, West, Central and Pioneer middle schools will dismiss students between 12:30 and 12:50 p.m.

Adjustments in the school district bus schedule have been made accordingly. Parents have been asked to

make arrangements for this revised schedule.

Teachers will discuss issues in secondary education and share ideas about meeting students' needs. The meetings will focus on students in grades six through twelve. The activities were developed by teachers from all of the buildings involved, based on the needs identified within the district.

Topics the teachers will study include effective communication with parents, ways of checking student progress and managing student behavior.

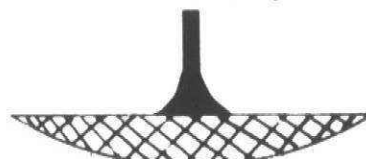

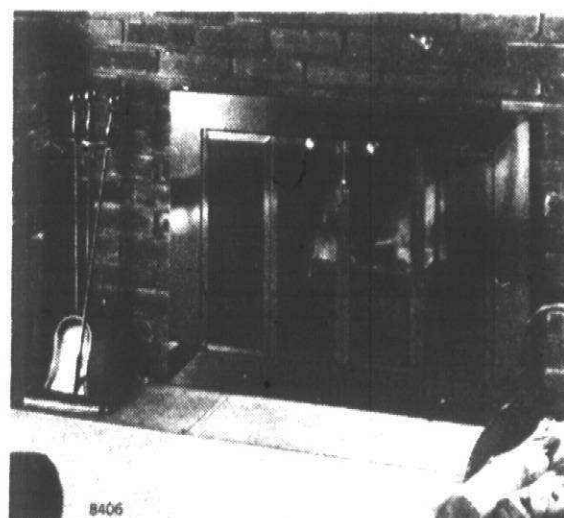

Jim Gemuend kicked the extra point, his first of five without a miss during the afternoon.

Franklin coughed up the ball at its 26 yard line later in the first period and the Spartans made short order of scoring again. Hall ran five yards for the TD.

Stevenson made it 21-7 early in the second period when Gemuend capped a 53-yard drive by plowing into the endzone from two yards out.

The Spartans had to advance on 31 yards for their fourth TD of the first half after the Patriots made another ball-handling boggle.

Hall produced the points with a 14-yard run.

A 40-yard pass from Hall to Rick Arnold in the fourth quarter concluded the scoring.

# Massey field in poor condition

**Sports Editor:**

We are writing with regards to the Don Massey softball field.

For more than three years the City of Plymouth has been developing the recreation facility with the help of Mr. Don Massey. (The field is located on Plymouth Rd., west of Haggerty) The city has been able to fence the field as

well as put in one of, if not the best lighting systems in the area.

However, for a good part of the season no less than four lights and as many as six were not in working order. Also, the gate in left field was either not there or broken.

However, the major problem at the facility is the outfield grass or should

we say weeds. The outfield is a disgrace not only to the City of Plymouth but to Don Massey.

By now, with proper care over the years, the city should have a respectable outfield, not a bunch of weeds and dirt. At the end of the fall of 1977 the city chose to rip out the outfield at the Massey field and try again. Note we said the end of fall, not the end of the softball season.

In the fall of 1977 the city made a feeble attempt to level the ground. Last November's first snow and its melting showed the field was far from level because of all the large puddles. On more than one occasion this past softball season the infield has been in great shape but there have been puddles in the outfield. The grounds crew has had to sweep them away before the game could begin.

Now, once again, the City of Plymouth is attempting to level the field. Instead of using good black dirt, it is using dirt with sticks and stones in it. It also has spread a very small amount of seed around.

When is it going to occur to the city that Mr. Massey may get upset with the way the city is taking care of the

field? Mr. Massey should not be expected to foot the bill for sod either. By now, the city should have a good looking field after these few years.

Now is the time to apply seed to keep it watered, and have the local lawn spraying company come out and spray and give it the full treatment next spring and summer. Also the city should cover the new seed with hay so birds don't eat the seed, as it has happened in the past.

The city may claim it doesn't have any money to do this, but we offer this to that claim. Just look at the number of man hours the recreation and public works department has spent on the repair or replacement of the Massey, outfield. That alone adds up to a considerable amount of money. This, of course, does not mention the city surplus each fiscal year. So the claim the city has no money is a statement of little value.

We hope that the city takes quick action to help make the Don Massey Field a place that is respected, not laughed at or be a source of embarrassment for Mr. Massey.

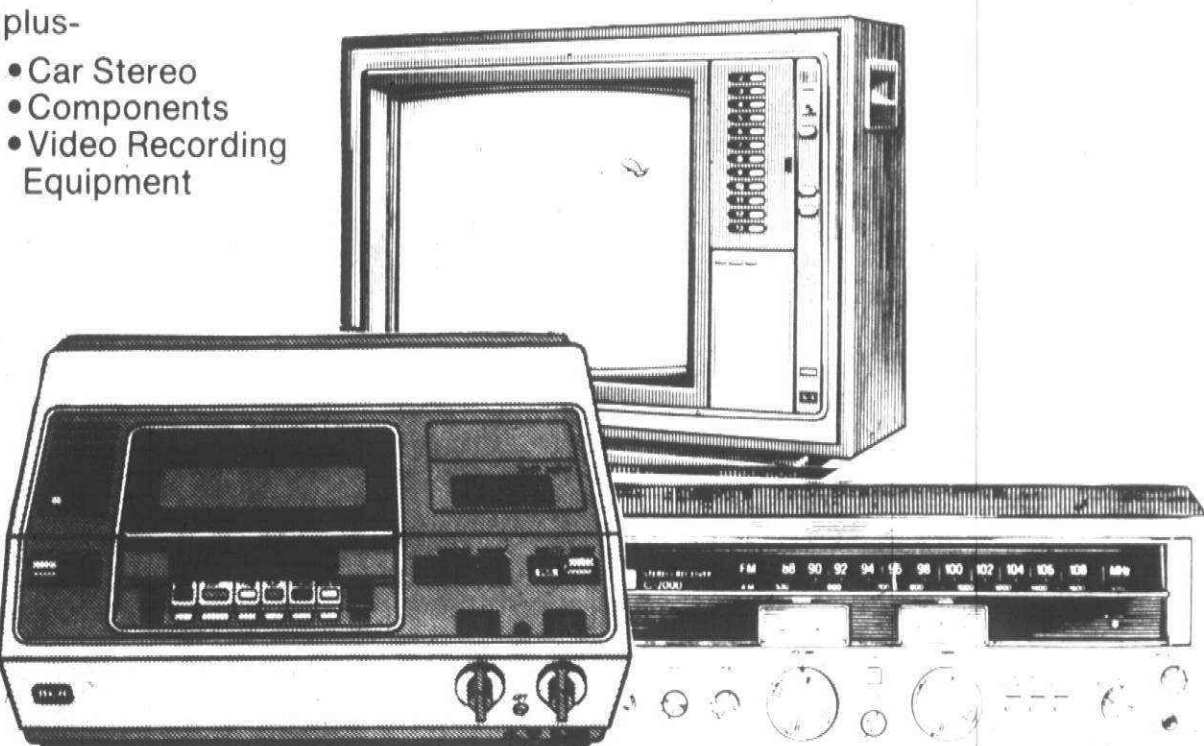

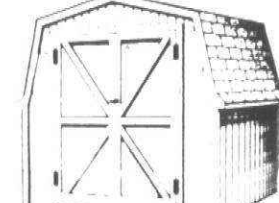

# Transit bills will benefit local roads

Would you pay an average of \$20 more per year to have better roads and transportation in Canton Township?

That's about what the average motorist could expect to pay in increased gasoline and weight taxes per year if a proposed transportation package makes it past the Michigan Senate to the governor. The combination of proposals, which would provide more money for roads and public transportation, has made it through the House of Representatives by a slender margin.

State senators will begin the process of hearings and committee meetings to discuss the package before any action is taken.

The combined proposals, as they stand now, are expected to generate about \$90 million more in revenues from gasoline taxes and \$20.1 million more in weight taxes, and would designate about \$20.9 million of the unearmarked portion of sales tax on gasoline, motor vehicles and vehicle parts and accessories sold by new and used merchandise dealers.

There are other provisions having to do with bonding and distribution.

BECAUSE CANTON is a township, its roads are entirely under the jurisdiction of the Wayne County Road Commission. Canton doesn't get road money; the road commission does. A city can be assured of getting its fair share of the increase in fees. The overall increase would be 25.6 per cent.

Canton, however, will have to compete with the other townships in Wayne County for road improvement just as it does now.

Naturally, everyone in Canton would hope that this township's roads will have the highest priority.

That makes one of the proposals of major importance to Canton. The provision would require at least four per cent of the total amount returned to county road commissions from the state fund to be returned for local road systems.

Thus, although the Wayne County Road Commission will have to spend a certain amount on local road improvements, Canton can't be guaranteed it will get an additional 25.6 per cent worth of services that cities will be assured of.

Any increase in services is bound to be welcomed. Whether the increase in services will match the increase in costs remains to be seen.

CRITICS OF THE package say too much of the money would go to mass transportation programs in metropolitan Detroit. Actually, public transportation everywhere in Michigan would get only the same 25.6 per cent that road interests will get, and metropolitan Detroit would get only a portion of that.

The current rate of inflation may swallow up too much of the new funding to have a major impact in road improvement.

Nevertheless, we feel the proposals are honest attempts to do something about the deteriorating condition of roads in the state. There has not been an increase in gas or weight taxes for several years.

It's a gamble for Canton residents, because there are no guarantees for townships.

WE SEE nothing wrong with supporting public transportation, as long as it is remembered that the bus shouldn't stop at the Detroit city limits. Suburbanites aren't necessarily adverse to leaving the driving to someone else if they have that option.

## Hello, sunshine

Michigan's Open Meetings Act, which we like to call the "sunshine law," won a significant victory in neighboring Washtenaw County last week. Visiting Judge Gene Schnelz of Walled Lake upheld the constitutionality of the law which requires government agencies to conduct business where the public can watch.

What happened was that Republicans on the Ann Arbor City Council held a secret caucus and revised the budget, then voted their decisions in public. Schnelz not only called the secret meeting improper, but he threw out the GOP budget. It was an expensive lesson for those who prefer government by sneakery.

Schnelz went a step further. When the GOP caucus argued it should have the right of secrecy because the law allows secret partisan caucuses in the Michigan Legislature, the judge ruled those Lansing secret caucuses are illegal, too.

Whether the section of his ruling applying to the legislature sticks remains to be seen. The ruling as it affects local government everywhere in Michigan seems on solid ground.

The sad fact is that Republicans in Ann Arbor—along with Democrats and nonpartisan folks elsewhere—think they must go into hiding to make governmental decisions. Unless one is a crook, secrecy simply isn't necessary. Officials need to make up their minds that they can work in the sunshine. It won't kill anyone.

Somewhere, I once read that squirrels love the sound of a typewriter. They do.

On a nice Sunday I am in the habit of plugging my Underwood into an electrical outlet out back where the breeze plays a lullaby through the leaves.

IT'S NOT DIFFICULT to let the mind wonder who these squirrels might be in real life. There are apt to be six or eight at a time, even a dozen if a roll call vote has been called for.

When several lions congregate, we call it a "pride" of lions. Fish have their "school" and larks their "exaltation." I'm convinced squirrels are so close to human they have discovered the committee.

At Camp David last week, President Carter was locked in talks of utmost world importance with the heads of government from Egypt and Israel. While all the shining lights of the Washington press corps were engrossed in the progress of those negotiations, the U.S. Postal Service snuck in an announcement that we are going to nine-digit zip code numbers.

It was evident that Postmaster General William F. Bolger remembered Lincoln's famous remark, "You can fool all of the people some of the time—pick your spots."

If I could yet understand squirrel talk, I could have had a news scoop of top postal rate dimensions. # Kissinger views trends

While the summit meeting was being held at Camp David last week, Henry Kissinger came to Oakland County to encourage the reelection of Bill Broomfield, congressman from 19th District.

Broomfield is the ranking Republican on the House Foreign Affairs Committee and worked with Kissinger when he was secretary of state.

At a fund-raising luncheon at the old Raleigh House, Kissinger tried to be light, joking about his alleged large ego. He started off thanking Broomfield for holding his introduction to 10 minutes because he has a problem looking humble for an extended period of time.

His main thrust was his observation about the direction the country was heading.

KISSINGER WAS careful in his comments about the present administration. All he said about the Camp David meeting was that it was in our nation's best interest that it succeed.

He also cautioned his audience that signed agreements are not peace. He said "the world doesn't stop when agreement is reached." He reminded the audience there are many other nations involved in the mideast problems.

He said America must be strong or the free-thinking people of the world will lose faith in the future.

He said he is concerned by the trend that plans for all new weapons are being scrapped, deferred or subjected to negotiation over an extended period of time.

Kissinger was critical of the Carter Administration's human rights program. Through detente,

## Headlee can harm transit

In southeast Michigan, public transportation is something of an "infant industry." Only a tiny percentage of all person-trips we make are by public transportation.

That percentage should increase. One reason is that many folks lack mobility for jobs, shopping, personal business. Another is that public transportation is a wise environmental tactic: A bus can move more riders per gallon of fuel than any auto. Still another reason is that our increasing traffic congestion can be alleviated by buses and trains.

Yet the fact of life is that, except for the Woodward corridor, public transportation can't take in enough at the farebox to break even. There must be some tax support. Public transportation must be considered a public service, just like police protection and schools.

SO MY QUESTION, directed to Larry Salci, general manager of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority, was: What happens to transit funding if Michigan votes in tax limitation?

Salci's answer was disheartening. While he personally finds the prospect of a cap on his own taxes charming, he says SEMTA will need new money after 1980. This is assuming the so-called "transportation package" passes the upper house of the Michigan Legislature this week.

"They tell me, 'Shut up, Salci, people don't want to hear about more taxes.' But as a professional, I have to tell people it will take more," he said.

"The effect of Headlee," he said, referring to the tax limitation amendment on the Nov. 7 ballot, "will be to shift tax effort from the state to the locality, as far as SEMTA is concerned. If SEMTA wants additional program, it means more taxation. A vote of the people will be needed in 1980."

That prospect may be a dim one. Schools, which touch the lives of more than half our population, have enough difficulty raising new money. Public transportation, touching maybe 5-10 per cent, is likely to have as much luck at the ballot box as a cotton subsidy.

### THE NUMBERS look like this:

For fiscal 1979, the combined budgets of SEMTA and Detroit's Department of Transportation (D-DOT) show operating costs of \$104 million.

Less than \$40 million of revenue comes from the farebox. Nearly \$30 million comes from the federal government. That leaves \$34 million to be raised from state and local sources.

The big item in that \$34 million is some \$16.5 million which comes from the current state transportation fund. That fund is filled by state gasoline, diesel fuel and weight taxes. In an era of more fuel-efficient and lighter cars, such a fund will tend to be more static as a revenue producer than taxes tied to (say) income, retail sales or property values.

Salci's five-year projection of SEMTA and D-DOT operations shows that by the end of 1980 the combined systems will have used up any new revenue from the tax package now being debated in Lansing.

On top of that, one provision of the transportation package is that the percentage of the fund which may go to public transit is to be frozen at no more than 10 per cent. At least 90 per cent of the fund must go to roads, according to a constitutional amendment on the Nov. 7 ballot. Thus, the legislature's hands are tied if it wants to dip into the fund to help public transit.

Clearly, public transportation will suffer, particularly after 1980, if the Headlee amendment or one of the other tax-cutting schemes is adopted. To those who think the automobile is the only patriotic means of transportation, that will be good news.

There is far more to this Headlee tax limitation business than meets the eye.

# Pursell backs bill to aid in spying on foreigners

Here's how area members of congress were recorded on major roll call votes immediately following the summer recess.

## HOUSE

**SPYING ON FOREIGNERS**—Adopted, 178 for and 176 against, an amendment making it easier for the U.S. government to conduct electronic surveillance on foreigners in the United States. The amendment eliminated a proposed requirement that the government obtain a court warrant for electronic spying on foreigners suspected of threatening national security.

It stipulated that such surveillance need be authorized only by the attorney general and a designated "national security official" in the executive branch. It was attached to HR 7308, a bill setting stricter rules for government spying on foreigners. The bill was headed toward final passage and consideration by the senate.

Rep. Eldon Rudd (R-Ariz.), a supporter, said: "It makes absolutely no

sense whatsoever for our intelligence personnel to obtain judicial warrants to conduct electronic surveillance against foreigners visiting our country—when those persons might have known or suspected ties to Communist governments or terrorist organizations.

Rep. Edward Boland (D-Mass.), an opponent, said: "History shows and the record proves that oftentimes the information which was collected under the guise of surveilling foreign powers, foreign embassies and consulates was used against American citizens. That is the reason why we have an across-the-board warrant in this bill."

Members voting yea favored eliminating the warrant requirement.

Reps. James Blanchard (D-Pleasant Ridge) and William Broomfield (R-Bloomfield) voted yea.

Reps. David Bonior (D-Mt. Clemens), William Brodhead (D-Detroit) and Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) voted nay.

Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor) did not vote.

**NEW YORK AID**—Passed, 233 for and 132 against, a measure (HJ Res 1088) giving final congressional approval of the \$1.65 billion federal loan guarantee said necessary to prevent New York City's bankruptcy. The bill, which now goes to the senate, follows up the 1975 financial bail-out legislation for New York that expired June 30. In part, it appropriates the \$1.65 billion on a standby basis.

Rep. George Mahon (D-Tex.), a supporter, said: "I hope that this assistance will not only enable New York City to avert bankruptcy, but also will give the city an entree to the credit markets."

Rep. Robert Bauman (R-Md.), an opponent, said: "Here is the first chance for us to save some money for the people back home and at the same time force fiscal responsibility on the City of New York."

Members voting yea favored the loan guarantee for New York.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead, Blanchard and Pursell voted yea. Broomfield voted nay.

**ABORTION**—Adopted, 224 for and 131 against, an amendment to prohibit U.S. Civil Rights Commission involvement in the abortion issue. It

was attached to HR 12432, a bill extending the life of the commission through 1983. The bill was sent to conference with the senate.

The commission was created 21 years ago to function as a federal watchdog over civil rights violations. In recent years, it has held that anti-abortion laws discriminate against poor, minority women by denying them equal protection under the law.

Rep. Thomas Hagedorn (R-Minn.), a sponsor of the amendment, said:

"The issue of abortion, in itself, is a critical one—but it is not a civil rights matter."

Rep. Don Edwards (D-Calif.), an opponent said: "Sometimes we disagree with the suggestions that the Civil Rights Commission makes. It does not mean that we should indulge in congressional censorship."

Members voting yea felt the commission should stay clear of the abortion issue.

Bonior, Broomfield and Pursell

voted yea. Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted nay.

**BUDGET CUT?**—Rejected, 25 for and 44 against, an amendment to lower by \$17.7 billion the amount of the fiscal 1979 federal budget. It was proposed to H Con Res 683, the resolution setting budget ceilings to guide congress in its consideration of individual spending bills. H Con Res 683, which now goes to conference with the house, already had cut existing fiscal 1979 budget authority by \$11 billion, to \$540 billion. Fiscal 1979 begins Oct. 1.

Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-Utah), a supporter, said: "The reason that spending is out of control is that the Congress does not give as much weight to defending the taxpayer's purse as it does to accommodating the pressure groups and building its spending constituencies."

Sen. Edmund Muskie (D-Maine), an opponent, said: "There are program needs that cannot be further compromised or cut, or whose constituencies are such that there is no practical way to achieve further cut."

Members voting yea favored cutting the 1979 budget across-the-board by \$17.7 billion.

Sen. Robert Griffin (R) voted yea. Sen. Donald Riegle (D) voted nay.

The conference, to run from 12:30 - 4:30 p.m., will enable women to talk with women elected and appointed to local, county and state offices.

positions on local, county and state levels and how to write effective resumes for those posts, a conference spokesman said.

# S'craft seeks \$2.5 million for construction

Schoolcraft College trustees are telling the governor's office they have three building priorities—and they are excluding a fine arts auditorium.

A capital request program filed with the state bureau of management and budget says the college wants:

- A new library resource center, double the size of the present Bradner Library—\$3.35 million.

- Remodeling of the present library, mostly for business offices—\$630,000.
- An addition to house the college's prestigious culinary arts program—\$1.5 million.

If the state agrees to put up approximately half the funds, the college would float a \$2.5 million bond issue.

THE POLL was unanimous on the

culinary arts addition, but 6-2 on the library package.

Trustees Rosina Raymond and Len Wozniak looked at the additional \$140,000 it would take to operate the new library, said the college lacked the operating funds and opposed the library package.

On the political tactics, President C. Nelson Grote commented, "We are in

a stronger position if we identify fewer and more major projects.

"A library is non-controversial. We have absolutely outgrown our (present) facility. It's half the size it ought to be. North Central (accrediting association) will be in between now and 1981. It's to our advantage to have a new library underway."

VICE-PRESIDENT Kenneth Lind-

ner said that if state funding were lined up, Schoolcraft could select an architect by June of 1979 and start construction by October of 1979.

A new library would have approximately 52,000 square feet of space compared to 23,600 square feet in the existing library. Lindner gave this breakdown:

- Core area—11,000 square feet for

audio visual and learning materials, video taping areas, slide viewing areas and photograph lab.

- Stack area—10,000 square feet for 100,000 bound volumes, periodicals, documents, index areas, microfilm, record and tape storage.
- Study area—15,000 square feet with study carrels and seating for 500 students.

## Medicare recipients apply

To make sure you have Medicare protection the month you reach age 65, contact the local Social Security office two or three months before your 65th birthday.

"You do not have to retire to get Medicare. You can get Medicare even if you work full-time. But you must apply for it if you are working and not receiving Social Security benefits," said Charles Anderson, manager of the Social Security office at 15435 Middlebelt, north of Five Mile.

"You have a limited time to act in order to have full Medicare protection at 65. If you fail to apply within three months after your birthday month, medical insurance coverage may be delayed for up to a year and your monthly premium may be higher," he said.

When contacting Social Security, have available your Social Security number, proof of age, and W-2 form or self-employment tax return for the previous year.

Medicare provides basic health protection against the high cost of illness after a person reaches 65. Medicare hospital insurance covers inpatient hospital care and, when necessary, care in a skilled nursing facility and home health services.

Medicare medical insurance helps pay for doctors' services, outpatient hospital services, physical therapy and speech pathology. Also for a variety of other medical services and supplies.

Information about medical and Social Security cash benefits may be obtained at your local Social Security office. The Livonia office on Middlebelt serves Livonia, Plymouth, Canton and Northville.

# New day coming for Plymouth Center?

Eranell McIntosh-Wilson—young, confident and stylish—has taken the reins of the scandal-scarred Plymouth Center for Human Development. She is the third director named since charges of wide-spread abuse rocked the center seven months ago.

The contrast with her two immediate predecessors is stark. The others were stern disciplinarians and no-nonsense administrators. Mrs. McIntosh-Wilson comes across as outgoing and relaxed.

Since the dismissal of former director William Womack, two state department of mental health stars were dispatched to the troubled Plymouth Center. Both Evelyn Provitt, who was given the task of stopping the abuse, and David Rosen, who was charged with setting the center on a new course, left for other positions.

MRS. MCINTOSH-WILSON will be trying to keep the besieged center on the course set by her predecessor, Rosen.

Like Rosen, her top priorities are to improve training for attendants, expand training and recreation for residents, make physical surroundings less institution and move most of the center's residents back into the community.

"It has a long way to go to the point where I'd even feel comfortable saying it's adequate," she said. That, she said, might take two years.

Much attention has been focused on the Plymouth Center for Human Development and its ills. And rightly so.

Little, however, has been reported on what can be done and what is being done to make changes, clean up and set straight the scandal-plagued center.

This is the beginning of a continuing series that will examine the efforts of administrators, employees, community leaders and top people in the field of mental health. They are putting priority effort toward righting past wrongs and developing a better Plymouth Center.

Reporters Michael Matuszewski and Sherry Kahan are making a close study of these efforts. What they are learning will be reported in a six-part series, beginning today, and in subsequent articles as events indicate.

The Plymouth Center does not have that luxury, though. It is under the gun of the courts and Michigan Department of Public Health.

At the height of the controversy over the center's failure to come to grips with its problems, U.S. District Judge Charles Joiner issued a lengthy court order. PCDH has fallen behind the court's timetable in implementing many ordered changes.

In addition, the department of public health is threatening not to renew the center's certification unless a reasonable plan to correct its deficiencies is submitted in the next two months. If certification is lost, the center also

could lose up to \$9 million in federal aid.

THE NEW director has definite plans for turning the center around.

She said 10 new professional trainers have been hired, and 16 attendants have been singled out to help train their co-workers.

The center has adopted a new training procedure developed a private consulting firm and the state mental health department. According to the new director, this new in-service and on-going training sequence is a "prototype" for other state homes for the retarded.

IN A BREAK with the past, attend-

ants will be trained to be teachers rather than caretakers.

A two-volume training manual gives directions on how to teach the retarded skills such as dressing, grooming, washing and eating. The instructional manual's 500 pages cover nearly every step of every basic skill any child must master to function in the community.

Books alone, however, cannot turn the center around.

Plymouth's new administrators agree that the even though much of the abuse has stopped, attendants must realize they are dealing with human beings not "chattel."

"Institutions have a way of corrupting people," said Ibrahim Hussein, the center's new assistant director. "They have a way of desensitizing people."

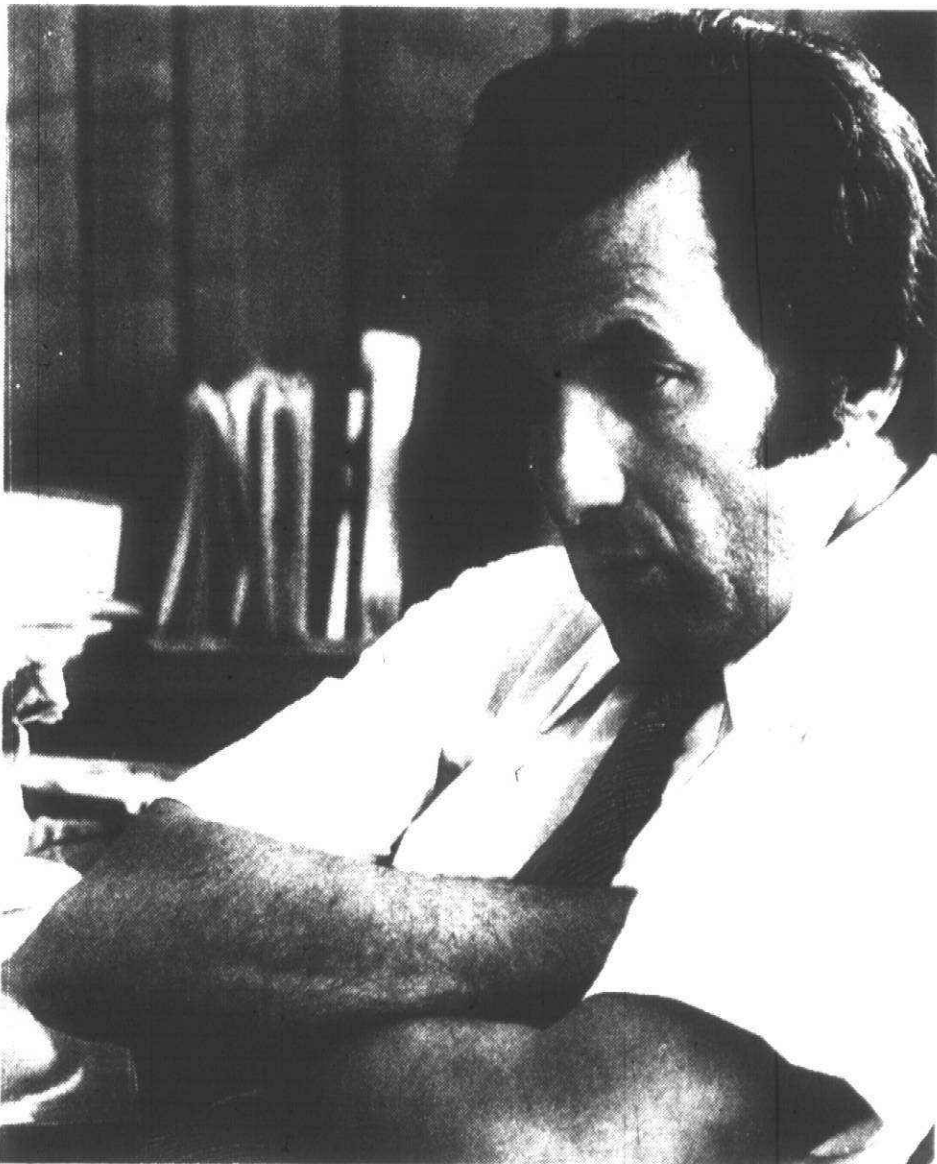
"It's not as if the residents here are people, but a little less than people," he said. He and Mrs. McIntosh-Wilson were quick to add that not all the attendants were "desensitized."

Abuse, Mrs. McIntosh-Wilson said, "is all a matter of frustration. It's human nature."

THERE ARE STILL injuries, she said, but few go unreported now, and "We're not getting people who are beaten. We're not getting the major injuries. We're not getting people coming in half dead."

What would happen, Mrs. McIntosh-Wilson was asked, if too few changes are made to save the center's certification and thus its federal support.

"I don't think about that at all," she said. "I just can't operate that way."

# Canton's powerful pressure shellacks Thurston, 52-36

What was supposed to be the first real test for the Plymouth Canton girls basketball team turned into nothing but a dull game, as the Chiefs romped to another easy victory over the Thurston Eagles in the Canton gym Tuesday night.

The massacre continued in the second half as Canton mounted a 30-point lead, 46-16, midway into the third period. That was before McCauley decided to take the press off the Eagles.

Thurston took advantage of Canton's

sloppy play in the last 1 1/2 quarters, but the outcome was never really in doubt.

"The pressure defense really bothered them (Thurston)," McCauley said. "They couldn't bring the ball down the court."

"We hustled well and it was a good team effort. Thurston's good around

the hoop with its big girls. They'll win 80 per cent of their games. They're tough went they get around the basket."

The Eagles dominated action in the early going when Canton had trouble getting a defensive rebound. Thurston controlled its offensive board in the

first five minutes until Canton's press took effect.

Jill Pedersen and Jean Timlin led Canton's balanced scoring attack with 10 points each. Vickie Cavallaro and Kelly Heaton added six each.

It was Cavallaro, Kathie Peck, and Dawn Malek who combined to lead Canton's original surge.

CANTON is off to its best start ever in the six-year history of the school. The Chiefs have never entered conference play with an undefeated mark. There was only one other time, in 1974, when Canton enjoyed a two-game win streak.

Coach Dave Schuele's squad now puts its undefeated and unscored-upon string on the line against the Mustangs after Friday's night 14-0 whitewash of Dearborn Hills, Annapolis.

Annapolis dominated play in the first half despite a 0-0 score at intermission. Canton then came out in the second half and took control of play enroute to the victory.

This Friday, Schuele says he is looking for more consistency from his Chiefs, who play a Northville squad which hasn't enjoyed victory yet this season.

"We have to play super ball and put two halves together," the Canton mentor said. "We can't count on holding Northville off and then run over them in the second half. They are bigger than us. It's the beginning of the league and both sides are fired up."

One of the reasons for Canton's successful start is the play of its interior line—especially on offense where Schuele thinks his players are faster off the line. The Chiefs' linebackers, Dave Tanner and Rusty Mandle, have also

played strong defense in serving as the heart of the unscored upon unit.

Northville looked horrible in its opening-season loss to Redford Thurston. Thurston had not won a game in two years before beating the Mustangs, 21-0. Northville showed great improvement against Westland John Glenn, however, losing 9-6 to one of the Northwest Suburban League favorites.

The Mustangs feature three 200-pound gridders on the interior line who anchor a power offense. They will also run the option and will the football, but only when forced out of the running game.

SALEM proved it might be a contender for the Sub-8 crown after its dramatic 10-7 Saturday victory over Dearborn. Rich Hanschu, a Dearborn transfer, haunted his old classmates by kicking the winning field goal in the final 10 seconds of play to give the Rocks their second victory of the season and 11th straight in regular season play.

Although the Rocks dominated the action throughout the game, they had trouble getting the ball into the end zone. Salem didn't score until the end of the third quarter after failing to reach paydirt on four different occasions—twice inside the five-yard line.

"We were moving the ball all night but we made twice as many mistakes as in the first game," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer.

"I couldn't believe all the blocking calls we missed, but we have a green team. This is where we are inexperienced. We couldn't sustain a drive."

Moshimer had nothing but praise for his "inexperienced" defense which limited Dearborn to only one first down the entire game after the Pioneers' original score.

"We held Dearborn to 61 net yards," Moshimer said. "That was a helluva of an effort. The defense really held them."

"These kids have done
