Stein calls for investigation of building dept. practices

The Canton Building Department may be the subject of an investigation by the Michigan State Police, but only Supervisor Harold Stein seems to know why.

Stein, who was in Washington earlier this week, telephoned state police Lt. William Tomczyk from the nation's capital Monday morning to request the investigation of the entire building department.

But Stein has apparently told no one of the evidence he says he unearthed against the department last Saturday.

Even Tomczyk is baffled. He says he has no idea what type of evidence the supervisor is holding against the department.

"He just hinted at some improprieties," the police lieutenant said. "But he didn't get specific."

"I don't know if there'll be an investigation or not. I'll have to determine if the evidence is criminal or just some political goings-on."

CHIEF BUILDING inspector Chuck Thompson and all six of Stein's fellow

board members are as perplexed as the state police over the supervisor's surprise request for the investigation. Board members received copies of Stein's letter to Thompson on Sunday. Thompson got the letter on Monday.

All they can figure out is that some missing building department records prompted Stein to take action.

Thompson confirmed that his department has lost or mislaid the file of at least one homeowner who has complained about structural defects in his home.

Gary Roberts, a Republican candidate for trustee, thinks he may know what prompted Stein to demand an investigation. Roberts claims he went to Stein with evidence that the building department had not followed the procedure set up by the township board to deal with homeowner complaints. According to Roberts, department employees did not always notify building contractors of the complaints. The trustee candidate also charges that at least one inspector was involved with taking bribes, and claims there is a signed affidavit to that effect.

Thompson confirms that there is an affidavit in Stein's files from a builder who claims an inspector indicated "he would go easy" in return for a window for his own home.

The inspector resigned about three months ago "for personal reasons." The charge was never confirmed or denied by Thompson. Thompson has been ordered by Stein to document all activities of the building department since August, 1975 in time for the township board's Oct. 3 meeting. The documents will be turned over to the Michigan State Police.

"But what's there to investigate?" a perplexed Thompson asked. "We run a clean department as far as I know."

Stein and the building department have been attacked by numerous residents in recent months for taking a soft stance with builders. The homeowners have complained that builders' have been lax about handling warranty complaints. There have also been complaints about the amount of time some builders are taking to complete new homes.

Trustees Lynne Goldsmith and Robert Myers theorized that Stein is now requesting an investigation of the

building department for political reasons.

After losing the Democratic nomination for supervisor in the August primary, Stein launched a write-in campaign.

"If Stein was aware of things going on, why did he wait until now to request an investigation?" Goldsmith asked.

"I'm sure if there was evidence, the board would want an investigation," she said. "But we don't know anything about it."

STEIN REFUSED to clear up the mystery when contacted by the Observer in Washington Monday afternoon.

At first Stein insisted that the state police and all six township board members had been informed of the investigation and the reasons behind it.

"If they choose not to talk about it, so be it," he said.

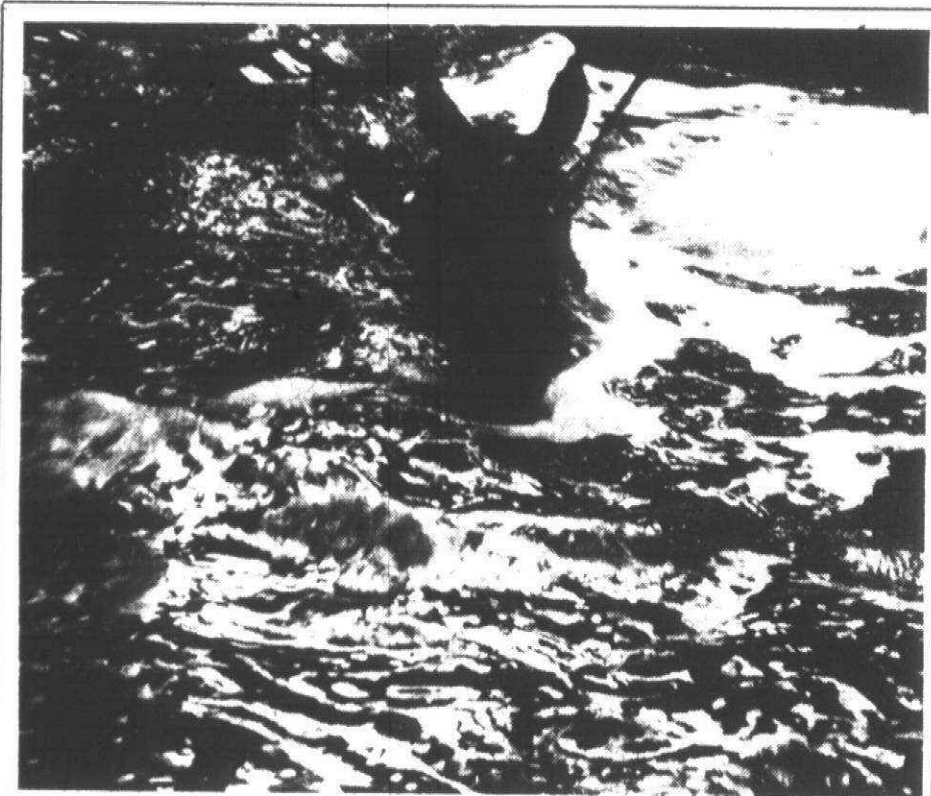
Stein later admitted, however, that he had not informed the township board "of every little detail, because

Whinney! They swim to win

If you were looking for unusual activities you'd find one if you walk into the Perfecta Farms stables at Five Mile and North Territorial Road.

There you'd see Gordon Holmes, who owns the farms, standing guard while horses are cavorting in an indoor swimming pool.

A swimming pool for horses!

It sounds preposterous. But there, in front of your eyes, you'd see the horses seemingly enjoying themselves while swimming around the 30-foot circular pool that was built especially for them.

It is a rather odd looking pool. While it is 30 feet in diameter with water 15 feet deep at the deepest point, it has a large pole in the center with six arms extending to the edge of the pool.

"This is one of the best things that has come along in quite a while for the care and training of horses," Holmes explains.

"Warm baths often are prescribed for human beings when they have aches or pains, so why not for horses?"

AS THE ANIMALS, hitched to one of the arms, go round and round, they get the same relief as the humans with hot baths. The water is kept at 65 to 70 degrees. And as Holmes explained the pool can be used summer and winter.

The idea of the pool, Holmes said, came from Florida. It was found that the constant pounding of their hoofs on the hard surface of the tracks causes them to develop sore feet. Placing them in water seemed to help.

According to those who oversee the treatment of the horses, the sessions in the pool not only bring relief to sore feet, but enable the horses to get the same exercise they would receive in running around the half-mile track.

With a wry smile Holmes also hinted that the sessions in the swimming pool have a tendency to make the horses do better at the track — Hazel Park, Jackson, or the DRC.

While it is up to the driver, according to Holmes, whether the horses indulge in session in the pool just before racing, but a close watch reveals that the horses, like humans, seem to freshen up after a swim.

Taking an animal through one of these sessions is interesting. First, the halter is placed over his head and he is led to a steep chute that leads in to the pool. The chute is made of two-inch plank and covered with heavy rubber treads from tractor tires. As the horse descends, he is hitched to one of the arms attached to the center pole. Once in the water, the horse's tail is tied to the bar in the rear.

Thus hooked up, Holmes explained, the horse is both pushing and pulling. It is an odd sight, but the horses are timed and are not given more than 15 minutes of swimming.

"I prefer to have at least two horses in the pool at the same time," another of the pool guard explained. "The horses seem to do better when they have company. They are much like humans on the beach."

AT THE END OF the 15-minute session the horse is taken to the exit ramp. This also is covered with the tractor treads, but in a different angle. This enables the horses to get firm footing and avoid slipping back into the water.

To add to this unusual training and treatment Holmes is in the process of adding a drying room for the horses. This, like the pool, will be an apparatus that will keep the horses moving, and a machine that will blow warm air on them until they are dry.

While Holmes has been at the present location for three years he has recently added a new barn and now has stalls for 80 horses. Aside from these he also has 20 outside.

The full complement doesn't enjoy the pool. Some of the animals are just boarders between the meets at the various tracks. Others are in training on the special half-mile track on the

Policy affects student records

The Plymouth-Canton schools proposed new student records policy hopes to keep the files in better order.

The board of education Monday discussed the new policy, which covers the collection, maintenance and dissemination of student records.

Members of a special committee which proposed the new policy say it isn't radically different from the schools' current practice. Ginny Murdoch, a committee member, says the major difference is that the new policy "really outlines" what should be kept in student files. It names the specific documents which should be filed, she says, while the old policy is vague about this.

Common to both the old and the new policy is that students can't see their file unless they're 18 years old, as provided by federal law.

THE POLICY covers all records that may be kept by the school, including attendance records, grades and disciplinary records.

Purpose of the policy is to "assist school personnel in helping students with their academic, personal, social and vocational decisions" within the boundaries of the law.

Murdoch says students are able to "sit with a counselor and go over the

content of the file, but may not look at it themselves."

One of the most hotly contested parts of the policy is the section regarding the conference interview summary sheet.

According to the new policy, "All significant interviews with students or their parents by professional staff members should be summarized and recorded on the Parent-Teacher Conference sheet." This record would remain in the student's permanent file.

This could include, Murdoch says, records of disciplinary discussions held with the students. It would be passed on from teacher to teacher as the student progressed through each grade level so the teacher at each level "could help the student as he went on."

Murdoch says the committee was not concerned that derogatory records of the previous year may bias a teacher's attitude toward the student.

"After all, it is an 'iffy, but and maybe' situation," she said. "It is entirely up to the teacher if these sheets will be included in the file."

OTHER AREAS covered in the policy include:

- The data in the student's cumulative record will be periodically reviewed for accuracy. Information no

longer relevant or required by law will be removed.

- Parents or students who feel the record is inaccurate can appeal to have the item removed. The appeal process can be extended as far as the board of education.

- No one other than authorized personnel, parents or students have access to a student's record without

the written permission of the student if he has reached the age of 18. If a student is a minor, written permission of the parent or legal guardian must be received before any information is released.

- School officials are to release only the name, address, birthday and attendance record of any student to police, courts or armed services.

SC strike ends; fact-finding starts

Schoolcraft College's 350 faculty members are back in class and 62 office personnel are at their desks today after an eight-day strike.

Wayne County Circuit Judge Thomas Roumell Wednesday ordered an end to the two unions' strikes, but he did so under circumstances the unions consider favorable.

Faculty Forum President William Nickels, bargaining spokesman Richard Arlen and attorney Harvey Wax gave this analysis of Roumell's order:

- Roumell ordered fact-finding and "came as close to ordering binding fact-finding as you can get." The college had requested state fact-finding but had opposed its being binding. Roumell said that if, at the conclusion of fact-finding, there is still no contract agreement, "the court will resume its active consideration and its authority, looking to the implementation of same"—language that appears to put pressure on the college to accept the fact-finder's report.
- Moreover, Roumell ordered fact-finding to be completed in 30 days. The original fact-finding schedule ran for seven weeks.
- Roumell ordered the unions to work under terms of their old contracts. The college had unilaterally extended the old contracts, prior to the strike, but had eliminated union dues checkoff and the grievance procedure. The college failed to get some new contract items it wanted in the court order—notably extension of the work day.
- The college last week had sought an injunction against only the Faculty Forum. Roumell applied it to both the Forum and the Association of Office Personnel. The unions had formed an alliance, striking jointly and vowing not to settle until both contracts were written.

THE OFFICE personnel contract had expired in mid-1977 and the faculty contract on Aug. 25. Both unions worked without a contract until their strike Sept. 18.

The Forum Monday defied Roumell's temporary restraining order of last Friday directing them to return to work. Nickels gave this explanation for the Forum's action:

"If we had obeyed the temporary restraining order, we figured the board would cancel the show-cause

hearing (which was Wednesday's court appearance) and we wouldn't have our day in court. We want to have a third party hear the dispute and act on it. We expected Roumell to do more than issue an injunction; we expected some controls."

Faculty members packed the courtroom and corridors during Wednesday's proceedings. Also on hand were seven of the college trustees, who had been subpoenaed as witnesses but were never called to testify.

Roumell, a one-time federal labor mediator, acted after two hours of consultations in his chambers with leaders and attorneys of the unions and the college. There were no open courtroom arguments. Afterwards, college officials and attorneys departed quickly and were unavailable for comment.

HERE IS the schedule of special events for the next few days:

The Cole Porter Cabaret, originally scheduled for Sept. 18, will be held Wednesday, Oct. 4.

The Detroit Saxophone Quartet recital of Thursday, the Schoolcraft College Foundation meeting of Thursday and the Jonathan Round concert of Friday will all be held as scheduled.

By pre-arrangement with union leaders, Schoolcraft's volleyball, soccer and cross-country events were held as scheduled during the strike. In fact, Schoolcraft's cross-country team ran a meet against Lansing Community College, which also was closed by a strike.

DURING THE FIRST week of the strike, faculty members were nearly unanimous in staying off their jobs.

After the temporary restraining order was issued last Friday, some returned to work. These included 27 of the 54 part-time instructors at the Garden City Center, 15 or 20 part-time instructors at the main Livonia campus and a half-dozen full-time instructors, according to both administration and union sources.

Forum leader Nickels said that early this week college administrators had passed word that contempt citations would be issued to striking faculty members who hadn't returned to work. So at Tuesday noon, the Faculty Forum discontinued picketing the college, so they could not be served legal papers, leaving picketing to the office personnel.

A lesser evil

Yack coolly backs Headlee plan

Tax reform fever has hit the state, and the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education is acting under the premise that one of the tax-limiting plans on the November ballot will be passed.

Which one of the three proposals is the question, and it makes a big difference to the school districts, say administrators and school board members.

Tom Yack, board president from Canton, recently voted to endorse the Headlee proposal over either the Tisch or voucher plans. He did this, he says, because Headlee would have the "least drastic effect on the schools."

The vote was taken at the Michigan Association for Improved School Legislation (MAISL), a group of nine school board presidents in the suburban area. It "bird-dogs" the activities of the state legislature on sc. The problem with the Tisch plan is that it is too drastic, Yack says. Under the plan, property taxes would be cut by 50 per cent. There is no alternate source of funding planned if it is passed, which would result in drastic reductions of school programs, he explained.

"I don't think most people would be willing to accept these cuts," Yack says.

Under the Headlee plan, 1978 would be used as a base year. Taxes would not be allowed to rise faster than the economy grows, with a measure for inflation allowed.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business for the district, says the voucher plan is "even more absurd."

"It is essentially parochial in disguise,"

Hoedel seems less than enthusiastic about supporting Headlee, too. He agreed, however, that it seemed inevitable one tax-limiting plan would be passed in November.

A suggestion that each board member contribute \$10 to be used to cam-

paign against the tax reform proposals got little support.

"It would be difficult for me to get all excited and run from door to door telling people not to vote for Tisch or the voucher plan, but to support Headlee," says Yack. "I have more faith in the voters' judgement than that."

He explained that he feels because so much information has been circulated on the proposals, people will be "intelligent enough" to head for the Headlee plan.

The Michigan Association of School Boards and the Michigan Education Association have both opposed all three plans.

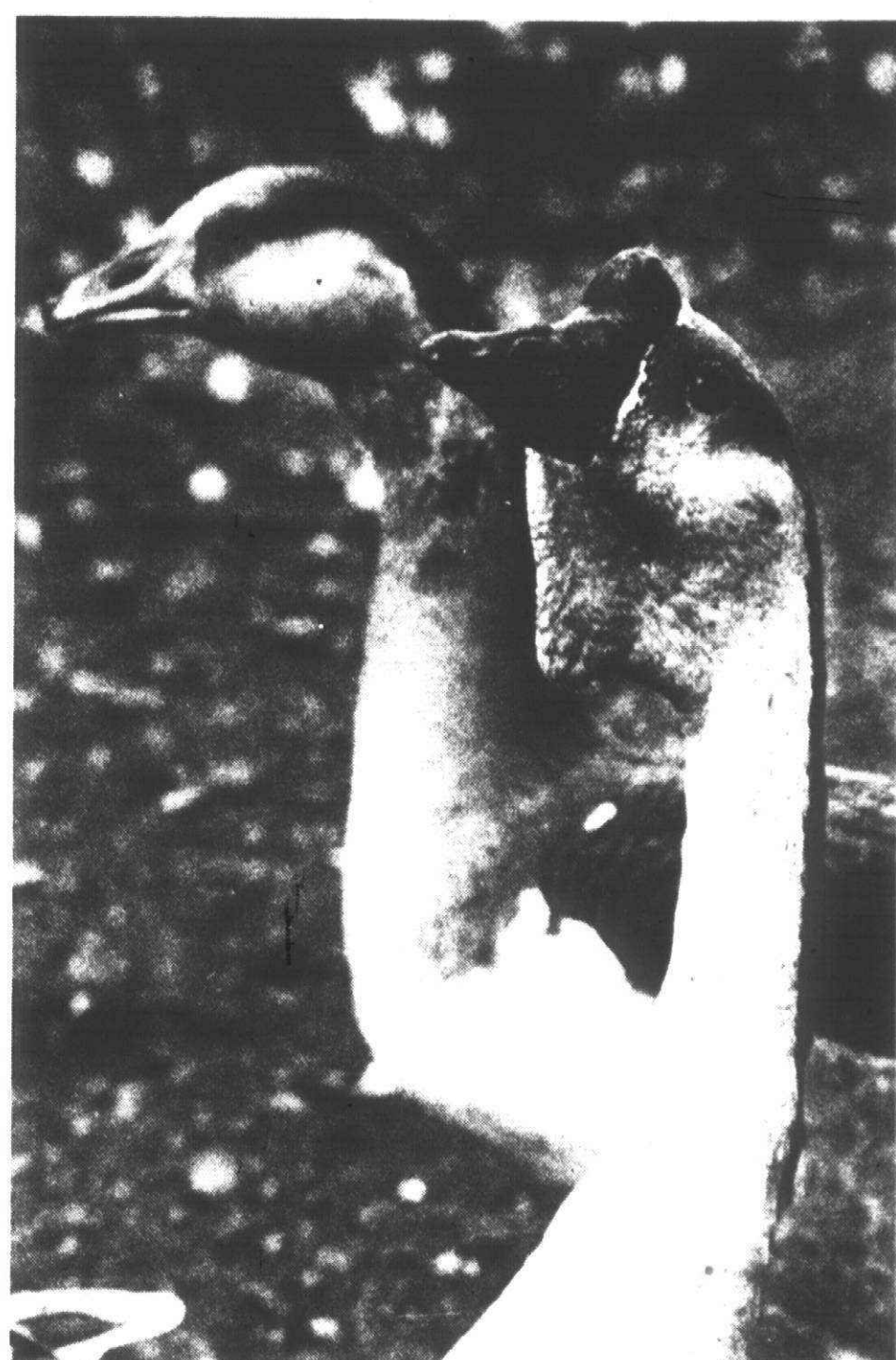

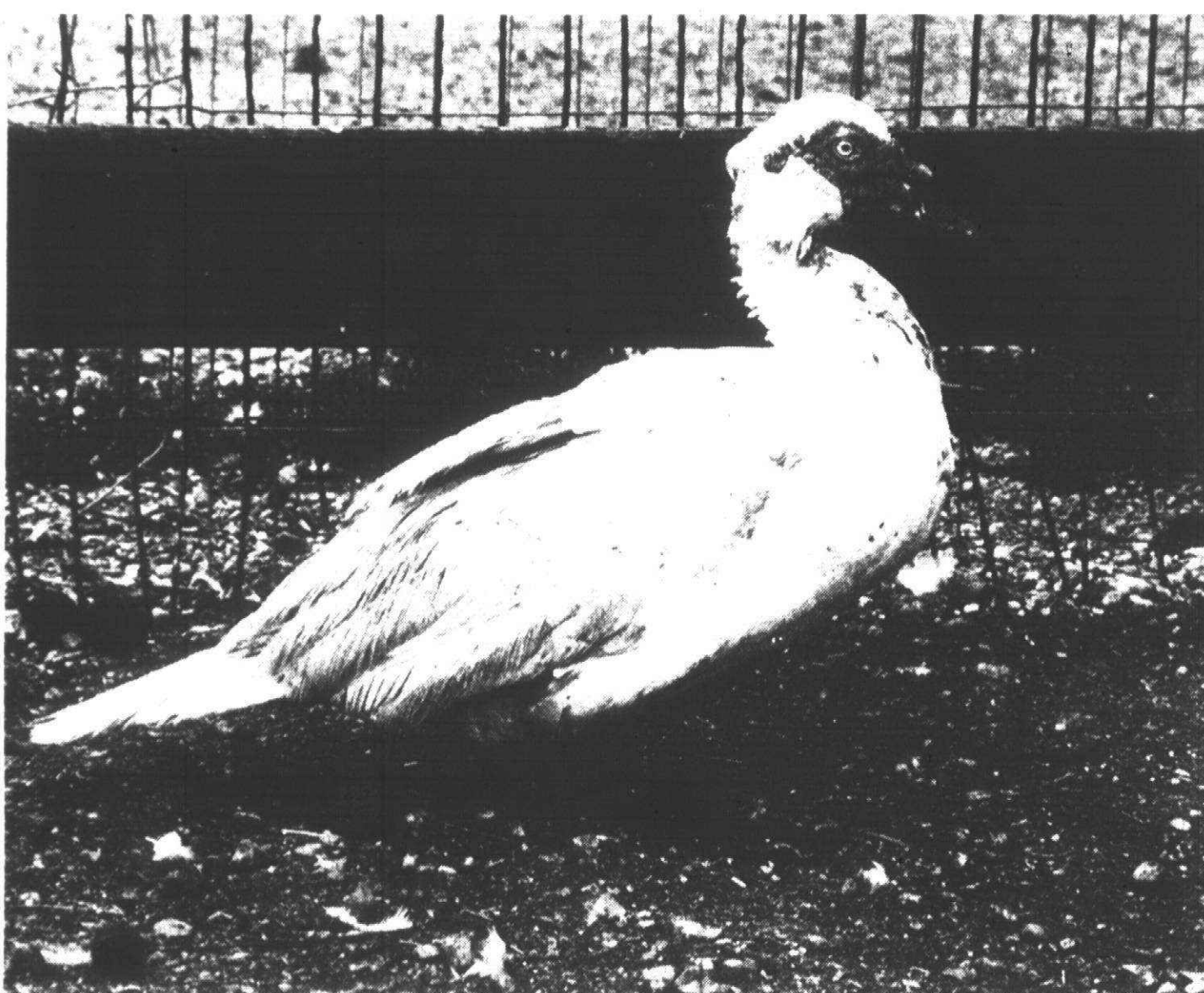

Eggplant is good

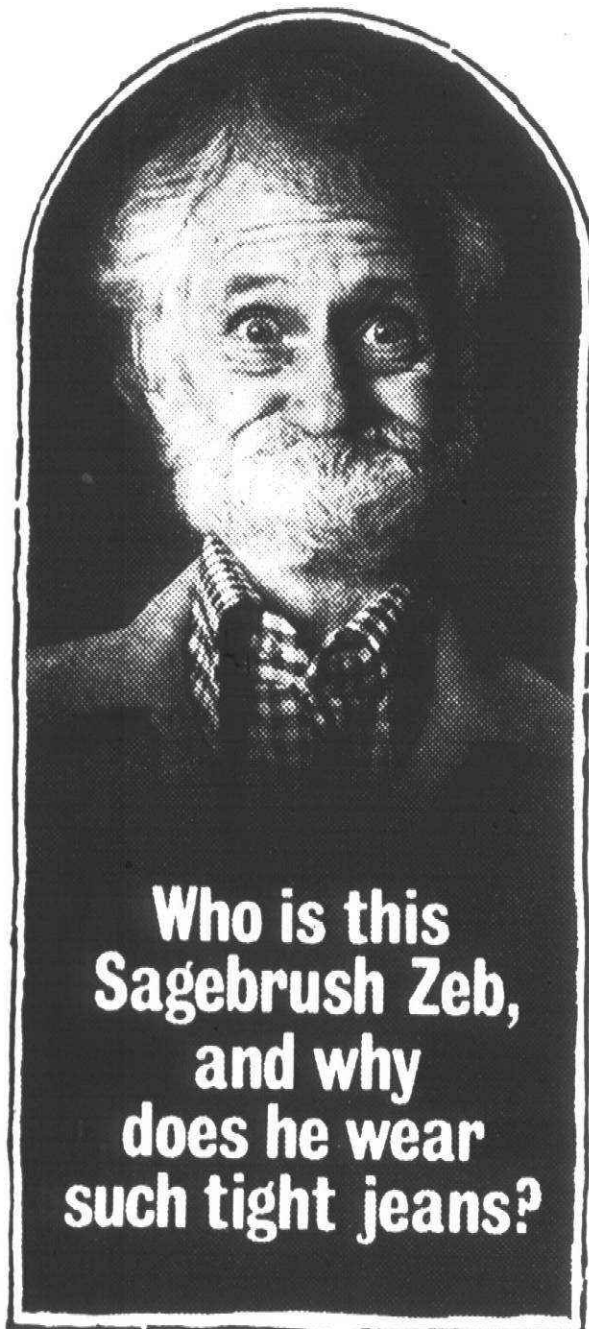
for freezing

As you look at the deep rich purple of an eggplant crowned with its grey-green cap, you will agree that this is the king of vegetables. Select eggplant when they have developed a full, bright color with a deep purple skin, but still are firm to the touch.

For freezing, wash, peel and cut into slices or cubes. Dip into a solution of one tablespoon lemon juice to one quart of water. This helps keep the eggplant whiter. Blanch for four minutes in boiling water. Cool quickly, dip again in lemon juice solution. Drain well. Freeze at once. Eggplant will keep high quality frozen for about three months.

To use, thaw eggplant in the refrigerator for several hours. Drain, and use in a casserole as you would freshly cooked eggplant.

An LWV summary

On the ballot: con con and crime measures

(EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the second in a series of articles on the 11 ballot proposals voters will consider Nov. 7. It was prepared by the League of Women Voters of Troy, a nonpartisan organization.)

PROPOSITION A

The issue: Should the State of Michigan draft a new constitution via a Constitutional Convention?

The ballot proposal concerning a Constitutional Convention appears on

LWV eyes ballot issues

Eleven ballot issues will be discussed at the Wednesday, Oct. 4, meeting of the League of Women Voters of Plymouth, Northville, Novi, Canton.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. at Mead's School at Six Mile and Bradner in Northville. The ballot issues to be examined include:

•Should the drinking age be raised from 18 to 21?

•Should bail be denied to certain "career criminals" or repeat offenders?

•Should prisoners serve a minimum sentence before becoming eligible for parole?

•Should a new constitutional convention be called to rewrite Michigan's basic laws, last revised in 1963?

the ballot because the 1963 Michigan Constitution mandates that the question of whether to hold a convention be put to the people every 16 years.

Amendments to individual articles of the constitution can be made by ballot proposals resulting from a petition drive or by legislative action, but a complete overhaul can be accomplished only through a constitutional convention. The issue then becomes: Do the voters want a few or no changes to the present constitution or

•Should property taxes be cut by half, while allowing a one percentage point increase in the state income tax? (Tisch Amendment)

•Should we eliminate the use of property taxes for financing schools and provide for state financing of public and private schools? (the voucher plan).

These are some of the questions voters will be asking themselves in November. The League, as part of its financing and governments services study, will be discussing the pros and cons of issues that Michigan voters will decide in the general election on Nov. 7.

The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

do they want major revisions?

If Michigan residents vote to have a convention, a special election would be held within six months to choose 148 delegates (one from each state representative and state senatorial district).

The convention would begin in Lansing no later than October 1979. At this time, delegates would meet to hammer out a new state constitution. A majority vote is required for any proposed constitution or amendment to be put before the voters. It would be submitted to the voters for approval or rejection not less than 90 days after adjournment of the convention at the time, and in the manner, decided by the delegates.

If the constitution or amendments are approved by a majority of the

voters, they would take effect as provided by the convention.

PROPOSITION B

The issue: Should parole be limited for convicted felons?

Under current law and usual sentencing procedures in Michigan, a person convicted of a crime is given both a minimum and maximum sentence.

Because of the reduced time provision, based on a formula that includes "time off for good behavior" in prison, convicts may be released at the discretion of the parole board before serving even their minimum sentences.

The theory behind the formula is that shortening prison terms provides

an incentive for rehabilitation.

Those who favor elimination of early parole cite reports of additional crimes committed by paroled prisoners and argue that society would be better protected if convicted felons were required to serve at least their minimum sentences. They feel knowledge of this requirement might be a deterrent to crime.

Opponents maintain that crime would not be deterred while prisons would become overcrowded at public expense with those who could be safely allowed back into the community under parole supervision. Feeling that behavior in prisons might deteriorate without the possibility of credit for good behavior, they favor strength-

ening the parole system to encourage sound judgment as to who might be released from prison with good supervision and help during parole.

Because the state legislature has not passed a law prohibiting early parole, a petition drive was initiated and the signatures were certified, thereby placing this proposal on the ballot.

If passed, it would amend the law by prohibiting the granting of parole to a person convicted of, and sentenced for, the crimes of murder, armed robbery, kidnapping, rape or any other serious felony in which there is injury or potential injury. This parole restriction would apply only until the minimum sentence imposed by the court had been served.

Stumps for Griffin

Ford ducks presidential plans



GERALD FORD
Time and options

Former President Gerald Ford came to metropolitan Detroit this week to stump for fellow Republican U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin.
His appearance at Dearborn's Hyatt Regency Hotel and a fundraising dinner for Griffin marked a return to Michigan's political arena.
WHILE FORD politely boosted the state's senior Senator, who had boosted him in their Washington days, much of the attention was focused on Ford's presidential ambitions.
"After the congressional and gubernatorial races, we'll think that one over. I've got lots of options and lots of time," he told reporters.
He also had lots of things to say about President Jimmy Carter and his administration.
The former president was especially critical of Carter's economic policies.
"They've blown it as far as I can see," he said. "We had inflation reduced to 4.8 per cent. Now we've got double digit inflation."
"Their fiscal policy has been bad

from the very beginning," he said.
Ford said Carter made a number of fundamental economic errors upon assuming the presidency.
The most important of those errors, he said, was increasing government spending. "That reignited inflation which we almost had under control," he said.
EVEN THOUGH FORD had plenty of criticism for the Carter Administration, he also offered a few words of advice.
He advised Carter to avoid wage and price controls to control inflation.
"History shows," he said, "that wage and price controls are bad for the economy. They're counter-productive in the long run. President Nixon found that out."
He said Carter should avoid even considering voluntary wage and price guidelines.
"It's almost inevitable that when you start talking about voluntary wage and price guidelines, you're going to wind up with mandatory wage and price controls," he said.

'Indian tribes' need fresh 'Y' recruits

Family togetherness will be the thrust of the Indian-A-Rama recruiting drive of the Plymouth-Canton-Northville YMCA next week.
Children at least 5 years old and their parents are invited to sign up for the YMCA's Indian programs at one of three registration sessions scheduled for next week.

Program participants are divided into "tribes" composed of six to eight parents and their children. They meet

Dues are \$23 a year. Participation in the program makes families automatic members of the YMCA.
Plymouth residents may sign up for the program from 7 to 8 p.m. Oct. 3 at Allen School. Canton residents may register from 7 to 8 p.m. Oct. 4 at Eriksson School. An organization meeting for Northville residents is scheduled from 7 to 8 p.m. Oct. 6 at Silver Springs School.

Dr. Kutinsky Could your glasses withstand the impact of a steel ball, 1/8 inch in diameter, dropped from a height of four feet, without shattering? If not, you're not wearing modern shatter-resistant lenses, which are treated to withstand such a test.

Even if you are not engaged in a hazardous occupation and you think there is little danger, why take unnecessary chances? Any accident that shatters your glasses could put jagged pieces of glass in your eyes and endanger your eyesight. If your present eyeglasses are more than a few years old, the lenses are probably NOT the safe, shatter-resistant type, which are now required in all new lenses.

Chance for minorities

Opportunity House a mainstreaming outlet

Another minority is battling for its rights.

This minority encompasses blacks, whites, various ethnic groups and men and women alike. When its members move into neighborhoods and suburban subdivisions, some homeowners and self-styled community leaders bristle in opposition.

The mentally retarded make up the minority. And their effort to live in normal community settings away from an institution has become a crusade in some metropolitan Detroit suburbs.

Community placement, sometimes called mainstreaming, is the wave of the present and the future as far as mental health administrators are concerned. They're out to do away with large, crowded institutions like the Plymouth Center for Human Development, which at one time held as many as 1,300 residents.

A beginning in the direction of mainstreaming has been made in this area, even while the Plymouth Center was rocked by charges of abuse.

Some retarded adults have been living for the last few years in Plymouth Opportunity House, a home built through efforts of the Northwest Communities Association for Retarded Citizens.

A similar home in Redford Township has been planned, but delays in building have developed. In Livonia, such a residence is still just a dream, but one that has been presented to city fathers.

But several homes have been opened through private enterprise in other communities in this area. Mainstreaming will come up for discussion at a special session to be sponsored by the Wayne County Association for the Retarded at 7:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 20, in John Glenn High School.

STILL, MAINSTREAMING means more than setting up foster and group homes in neighborhoods. It includes integrating the physically and mentally handicapped into other "normal institutions" such as schools and the job market.

The new approach, according to

Edwin W. Martin, deputy United States Education commissioner, came from realization that handicapped children in particular were not benefitting from traditional programs.

Even when a school had a handicapped program, he said, it often lumped together students with all sorts of mental, physical and emotional disabilities.

That attitude, Martin said, kept a handicapped person from learning to function in the everyday world. "After all," Martin told the Wall Street Journal, "he's going to have to live in a society of non-handicapped people."

WHILE MAINSTREAMING has attracted positive reviews in other parts of the country, its community placement aspect has caused a considerable stir in such communities as Southfield and St. Clair Shores.

"Drawbacks are seen by people in the community who are either bigoted or don't understand the rights of the mentally retarded," said Jerry Provencal, acting director of the Macomb-Oakland Regional Center for Developmental Disabilities.

Provencal and his predecessor, David Rosen, guided Macomb-Oakland to recognition as one of the world's leaders in community placement.

"Some people don't understand that there are risks in the retarded person growing up just like the risks we all face in growing up," the Macomb-Oakland administrator said. "Some people feel," he continued, "the retarded person is innocent and should be shrouded and protected at the expense of his own growth."

"Some people don't believe there's any benefit in the retarded person being as independent as he can."

"Some people say that because they should be protected let's not subject him to the chances and risks."

"That's very forgivable," Provencal said.

OFTEN, THOUGH, he said, opposition to foster and group homes for the mentally retarded have come from persons more interested in protecting their own property values than the safety of their would-be neighbors.

"Some people," Provencal charged, "don't see the mentally retarded as deserving. Some people think they're not as good as the rest of us."

"Some people don't believe they have the same rights under the Constitution or under God."

"That's bigotry at its rawest and the mentally retarded catch it just like any other minority," Provencal said.

EVEN THOUGH property owners and others may point to disadvantages in community placement, Provencal very confidently said that there are no drawbacks for the retarded.

The focus now, he said, is to move as many people back into the community as possible.

"It's not that institutions are inherently evil," Provencal said. "They just don't provide enough opportunities for individual expression."

"There are gang showers and large wards for bedrooms."

"It's virtually impossible to give the residents an opportunity to live the way we do. So many decisions are made for them based on the general need rather than the individual need," he said.

THE SMALLER, MORE normal settings may pay off in better and more intensive care and training as well as indeterminate personal growth, Provencal said, but there are also economic rewards.

Foster and group homes, he said, are very simply less expensive to operate. The massive initial capital outlay for new buildings is unnecessary if most of the retarded are being funneled back into the community.

The Macomb-Oakland acting director, however, cautions of a day when institutions might be less expensive to operate than community programs.

And in some cases mentally retarded adults who are part of group homes hold down jobs and become tax-paying members of the labor force.

PROVENCAL SAID, community placement is the only way to go.

He rebuffs those who contend it needs more time to develop.

"We're not talking pie-in-the-sky," he said. "What we've done can be seen. It can be measured."

Leaf removal begins Oct. 9

The annual pickup of leaves throughout the City of Plymouth will begin the week of Oct. 9.

Residents are being asked by the city to place their leaves by the curb in the street as only leaves placed in the street will be picked up.

The leaves should be placed at the curb as soon as possible because the city wants to remove them before any accumulation of snow.

There is no set schedule when trucks will be in any particular area, explains Kenneth Vogras, DPW director, although an attempt will be made to collect leaves from every area of the city at least once a week.

The DPW has set the week of Nov. 27 as the date when trucks will make the last pass through the city. Thereafter, any leaves residents have will have to be bagged for the regular refuse pickup.

Bid denied for 250 Center jobs

The Plymouth Center for Human Development had asked the state for 250 more employees. The Michigan Department of Mental Health (DMH) denied that request.

Previously published reports indicated that by saying no the DMH had violated a federal court order mandating increased staffing by denying the request.

This week, Plymouth Center and state officials denied those reports. They said the requested 250 positions were outside the jurisdiction of the federal court order.

The additional employees, which would have been hired in the coming fiscal year, would have increased the center's staff to 1,545. Instead, DMH approved a staff of 1,296 employees, 772

of whom will be attendants working daily with the center's residents.

DMH Acting Director Vernon Stehman and Donald Worden, regional director denied the request, saying the center did not prove the need for the new employees to comply with the order Federal District Judge Charles Joiner issued last March. That order contained a lengthy list of changes to improve conditions at the center.

However, center officials explained some of the denied positions had been targeted for improving programming and recreational activities for the nearly 800 residents.

Those positions were described by John Maciejewski, a Plymouth Center administrative officer, as some that "would have been nice to have."

Judge Joiner's order regarding staffing deals primarily with increasing the

number of attendants in the eight residence halls.

Plymouth Center Director Eranell McIntosh-Wilson said that the center will hire more than 100 new attendants in the coming months to bring it in line with Judge Joiner's order.

Keeping in line with the court-ordered staff increases, Plymouth officials said DMH and the state legislature will significantly increase the center's budget.

Plymouth administrators expect to receive about \$24.7 million for the coming fiscal year. \$6.5 million will be appropriated from a special DMH "discretionary fund."

Last year, the center received \$16.4 million from the state, but later received \$1.8 million as a special "emergency" appropriation.


Plymouth Center officials said they were not surprised when their staffing request was turned down. But they said the 250 new employees which they sought were not essential in meeting the court-ordered goals.

They said, however, that they received a verbal commitment from DMH officials that additional funds might be available if they could prove the need.

"We were told to come back," Mrs. McIntosh-Wilson said. "We'll just have to tell them that we can't do what you're asking us to do with this level of support," she said.



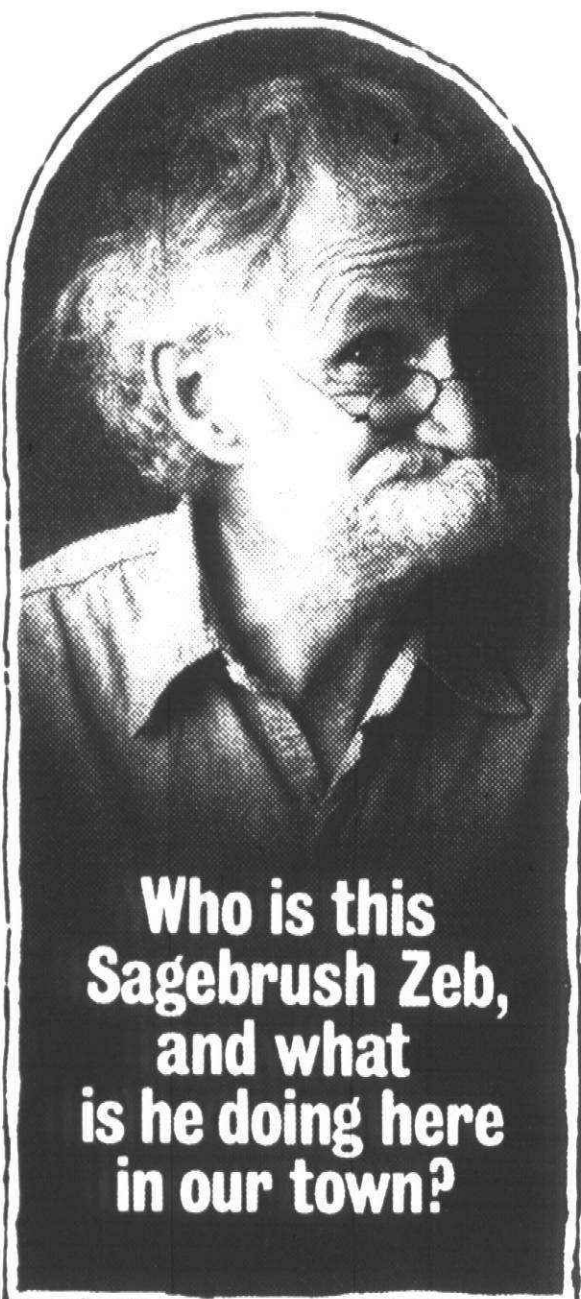

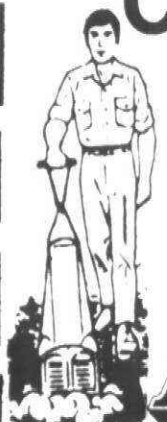

Libby Maynard is ready to lead

"I'll be an important part of the administration," said Democratic lieutenant governor candidate Olivia Maynard. "That doesn't mean my opinion will always be prevailing. But it doesn't mean I'll be in opposition to the governor."

That's how "Libby" Maynard, No. 2 person on the Michigan Democratic ticket, summed up her multiple roles as William Fitzgerald's running mate, as the first woman nominated by a major party for that office and as a liberal in a party that is shifting to the political right.

Mrs. Maynard, 42, the Democratic Party's unpaid state vice-chairman, was interviewed by two Observer & Eccentric Newspapers editors last week.

IF ELECTED, she would be one heartbeat away from the governor's chair. While gubernatorial nominee Fitzgerald is only 36 and in good health, the question was her own administrative experience.

"If someone said 'point to one thing,' it would be the party's policy committee. I served as co-chair of that since its inception six years ago," Mrs. Maynard said.

The policy committee is an attempt to make the party platform a full-time, grass roots effort instead of something slapped together by bigwigs in the heat of a quadrennial national convention.

Michigan Democrats pioneered the concept, and Mrs. Maynard is proud the national party is studying the state's work.

Besides the constitutional duty of presiding over the State Senate, Mrs. Maynard would like to be assigned two other tasks: Hearing citizen complaints about how government operates and being a trouble-shooter whenever a special problem, such as mental health department scandals, cropped up.

Mrs. Maynard also teaches part-time at Mott Community College, Flint. Her community services political science course is in practical politics—"how to lobby a bill through the legislature, the informal ways political parties operate, how to run things like millage campaigns, targeting precincts."

NOMINATED after intense pressure from the party's women's caucus, Mrs. Maynard said, "I don't consider myself a token. The campaign isn't being run that way."

As evidence she cites the "careful, objective process" Fitzgerald used in interviewing potential candidates and talking to party leaders before asking her to be his running mate.

She predicts a Gov. Fitzgerald would make more appointments of women and minorities to state boards and administrative positions, charging Republican incumbent William Milliken hasn't made enough.

If she differs from Fitzgerald on the politically sensitive issue of state-funded abortions, she argues, "A good administration can handle disagreement."

FITZGERALD'S overriding campaign theme has been business—business leaving the state, jobs being lost. Yet the Michigan Chamber of Commerce has given Fitzgerald's voting record in the State Senate a score of only 22.

"If you look at the chamber's ratings," Mrs. Maynard said, "The chamber rated on 16 issues, but only five were on business, and on only two votes did they say he was not right."

"One was the auto lemon bill. That's a consumer bill—of interest to all people. The other was workers' com-

pensation—using workers' comp tax funds to finance the bureau's efforts to gather statistics and reform it," she explained. "We need increased funding there—we have not had adequate statistics. Ultimately, that will come back to benefit business. Fitzgerald wants to reform workers' comp. You have to deal effectively with the violators, and then you can increase benefits to those who need more help."

INDEPENDENTLY wealthy, Mrs. Maynard is a member of the Cincinnati Proctor family of Proctor & Gamble company.

Raised a Republican, she became a Democrat while majoring in political science at George Washington University. She got into politics in 1964 when she and her former husband worked for a local legislative candidate in Flint.

In 1966 she worked for the gubernatorial candidacy of Zolton Ferency, who was just beginning his anti-Vietnam war break from Lyndon B. Johnson's Democratic Party.

Her personal heroes and heroines are a mixed lot.

No. 1 is Abigail Adams, who "ran the show when her husband was playing in the capital" and who always wrote founding father John Adams, "Don't forget the ladies."

'Star Wars' voyage's likely in 1980 in Huron

Suburban Detroit residents will be able to make their own trips to "Battlestar Galactica" or "Star Wars" starting in 1980.

A Livonia-based company has received approval for construction of nearly all major elements of a \$40-50 million-plus theme park in southwestern Wayne County. It will be based on space travel and the future.

The development, called Space World, will be on 366 acres just north and east of the I-275 freeway interchange at Will Carleton Road in Huron Township. The site is within 20-30 minutes driving time of western suburbs.

Planning the development is Space World, Inc., based in Livonia and headed by Philip Austin, a former engineer with the National Aeronautical and Space Administration and president of Space Colonization, Inc., part of his own Contamination Control Laboratories, Inc., all located in Livonia.

Austin, 42, of Livonia, plans to open the development by the spring of 1980.

The firm planning the development had first tried to locate the park in Ypsilanti Township, just off the I-94 freeway at Whittaker Road. But township officials didn't take action in time for work to be completed in time for the 1980 opening. Austin decided to move to the Huron Township location.

Austin stressed that Space World will be primarily educational and not be another Cedar Point or strictly an amusement park.

Goals of the park will be to "relate space to people," and Austin said that this type of a project has never been done before in America.

When completed, Space World will have a 32-acre lunar colony to let earthlings know what they can expect to find on the surface of the moon.

Space World plans also include an unidentified flying object museum, an

interplanetary space shuttle exhibit, zero gravity demonstrations, a 1,000 seat theater in which presentations will be given so that viewers will have a "Star Wars uplifting feeling," Austin said.

"Space World will give visitors a chance to see what it would be like to visit other planets," Austin said. There will be illusions and "hands-on controls" for visitors to handle.

Part of the development will also let people have a peek at what the future of the earth will be like, Austin commented.

"Space World will show how the space program can raise our standard of living," he said.

Austin, who did work for NASA on the Mercury, Gemini and Apollo space programs, said that the public is wondering "What kind of feelings will I have when traveling in space?" and Space World will help answer some of their questions.

"There is a strong need to teach people about these experiences."

Austin said he first started to think about a Space World-type development on a small scale after he was continually asked at social events and church about space travel and the astronaut program.

He designed the concept for Space World on a single Sunday and felt that it would only be an attachment to his

Contamination Control Lab offices on Farmington Road near Schoolcraft in Livonia.

But it soon grew and was expanded into a separate development.

Austin has said many times that Michigan is one of the top four tourist locations in the world, following London, Tokyo, and Paris.

When he was planning for the Ypsilanti township site, Austin said that the Irish Hills area through southern Michigan attracted 4½ million tourists a year without any attraction there.

In a prepared statement, Austin said Space World will be a "space-future themed development which will provide a broad range of experience

which will entertain visitors with exciting activities that appeal to all of the five senses.

"The use of static exhibitions, participatory exhibits, space simulations, futuristic theming of physical thrill experiences and multi-media show-type productions will diversify the implementation of the major theme such that Space World will offer new horizons to all visitors."

He said Space World hopes to "increase (the public's) awareness of how space and related technological progress can change the future of our planet if vision and imagination are allowed to enter the portals of this final frontier."

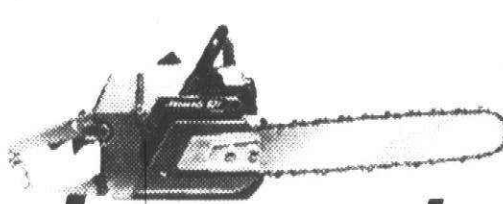
Austin said Space World will be open from May through mid-October and he projects a seasonal attendance from 1.3 million to 1.8 million in the first year with growth to 2.4 million by 1989.

SOME PROPOSED rides and attractions at Space World will be the "future space journey," moon colony journey, battle of the Milky Way, moon buggy rides, space wars gallery, cosmic disorientation, speed of light space race, international space museum, UFO museum, and a major space event re-enactment theater.

In the entertainment section of the development, there will be a central attraction galactic theater, spherical starship, children's shows and live entertainment in three pavilions.

Here's a protection I'd give away today

A bill now pending in the Michigan Legislature proposes to place some limits on lobbying activities, and require registration for the run-of-the-mill lobbyists.

By run-of-the-mill, I refer to quantity not quality. The proposed bill would require registration for those who lobby on a regular basis, or to make a living, but not necessarily for those who would lobby once a year or once a lifetime for a special cause.

The bill has some merit because it provides the public and lawmakers with a scorecard—identifying those individuals and groups who are players in the game of politics for the sole purpose of influencing the laws we live by.

A LEADING opponent of the measure argues that it represents an unconstitutional infringement on the right of citizens to communicate with their lawmakers.

The state constitution does guarantee the right of all citizens to petition the government, and to petition individual lawmakers of that government. The state and federal constitutions also guarantee the right of assembly or peaceful purpose, including influencing lawmakers.

The U.S. Constitution also, in the First Amendment, guarantees the right of free speech. But "free" is not to be tied to economics. It means government shall pass no law to unduly restrain the freedom of expression, providing such expression does not interfere with the safety of others.

GIVEN THOSE constitutional rights—at state and national level, I still find it strange to argue the proposed lobbying bill infringes upon constitutional rights.

I won't go into all the provisions of the bill, because there are many—most of which aren't applicable to the normal citizen. The bill, for instance, prohibits a lobbyist from making a personal loan to legislators. The bill also provides that lobbyists spending over a certain level in a year or month must register with the state.

Probably the most stringent of all the provisions is that any individual or group spending \$15 for a meal to influence a lawmaker must file as a lobbyist. And, frankly, that doesn't appear to be as an overly-stringent requirement—not, at least, for the run-of-the-mill citizen like you and I.

I have, on occasion, communicated with my lawmakers in Lansing and Washington. And all it cost me was a 13-cent stamp to mail in my views. I must confess, though, there were a couple times where my concern was of great enough magnitude to call my lawmaker's office in Lansing and I dished out about \$1.50 for a long-distance phone call.

But I've never been so concerned about pending legislation to take my lawmaker out to lunch, or breakfast, or dinner. Maybe I'm apathetic. And maybe that's what is meant about the apathy of our citizenry—none of us

cares enough to take a lawmaker out to lunch.

FRANKLY, THE limits in the proposed lobbying bill just don't have that much impact on you and me as citizens.

The bill will change, however, the role which individuals or groups perform when engaged in lobbying. And I suggest we need to make that distinction. A person who functions as a lobbyist is indeed a citizen also. But the constitution extends protection to his activities as a citizen, not to his professional activities as a lobbyist.

HAVING MADE that distinction, I conclude with a layman's observation that I see nothing unconstitutional in the proposed lobbying bill—which is to say I see nothing which infringes upon the rights of citizens.

I quickly add, though, that I have no personal problem with the function of lobbying in our representative form of government. In fact, lobbyists play an important function and the wheels of decision-making would turn exceedingly slowly if lobbying were eliminated.

Lobbying is a necessary art in the field of politics. It is a legitimate function, and is not in any way an evil one. If there is a problem with lobbying at all, it is a perceptual one. The problem, as I see it, is that we tend to iden-

tify as lobbyists only the more visible groups, i.e.: the AMA; Michigan Milk Producers; Farm Bureau; UAW; AFL-CIO; MEA; Michigan Chamber of Commerce; the petroleum industry, masonry institute, real estate boards, Michigan Association of School Boards, etc.

But, by definition, a lobbyist is any individual or group engaged in activity to influence lawmakers in a manner other than by voting on election day.

Thus our list of lobbyists also should include: consumer advocate groups; homeowners associations; parent-teacher groups; the League of Women Voters and, at times, the AAUW; ad hoc citizen groups; and even fraternal, civic or social organizations. That's but one of the reasons why I don't view lobbying as a tainted activity but a very necessary one.

The point is that it is not an undue burden to ask any of these groups to fill out registration forms declaring an intent to lobby whenever they plan to invest an untypical amount of funds to gain influence. You and I, as citizens, have a right to know who is spending money to influence legislation which affects our lives. We are not asking that the practice of courting influence be halted; only that we know who the influencers are.

I think that's fair and sensible. I don't think it is an undue hardship, a heavy burden or an infringement of rights.

Durr, Inc. occupying vacant plant

Otto Durr Inc., a manufacturing firm now located in Livonia, is expected to transfer its entire operation to the vacant Whitman-Barnes plant on Plymouth Road near Haggerty around the first of the year.

Peter Spiro, assistant to the company's president, said Otto Durr will hire 50 employees once the company moves to the new facility in Plymouth Township.

Spiro said the company plans to add 50 employees to its payroll each year during the next three or four years.

Otto Durr, a supplier of paint finishing systems to the automotive and appliance industries, currently employs about 200 persons in its plant near Plymouth Road and Newburgh in Livonia.

According to Spiro, the Livonia building has become too small for the growing company.

Spiro said the company plans to make extensive renovations in the Whitman-Barnes plant that has been vacant for about 1 1/2 years.

OTTO DURR representatives will seek financing approval from the Michigan Job Development Authority (JDA) next month. Approval from the

agency, established to keep Michigan industries in the state, will make the company eligible for low-interest loans.

If the company does not win JDA approval, Spiro says Otto Durr may seek low-interest financing under a 1963 law which transfers ownership of the industry's land to the municipality.

Under Public Act 62, the deed to the land on which the Whitman-Barnes plant is located would be given to Plymouth Township at no cost.

Otto Durr would pay the township rent for the land. The township would use the money to pay off Otto Durr's bonds. Once the bonds were paid off, the land would be transferred back to Otto Durr at no cost.

Under provisions of the law, Otto Durr would continue to pay taxes on the land even though Plymouth Township would hold the deed.

Spiro, Paul Tesoro of the Michigan Department of Commerce and a representative of the bonding counsel firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock & Stone appeared before the Plymouth Township board Tuesday night to explain the financing method.

They assured the board that Plymouth Township would not be

responsible for the bond payments under Public Act 62 if Otto Durr failed to make rent payments. The company would be foreclosed, and proceeds from the foreclosure would be used to pay off the debt.

Spiro asked the township board to give its support to the company's JDA

application and possible efforts to seek financing under Public Act 62.

The board voted 5-2 to support the company's JDA application with Trustees Maurice Breen and Lee Fedge voting no. The board indicated its support of Public Act 62 financing with a 4-3 vote. Trustees Breen, Fedge and Frank Millington voted no.

Morahan's in media

Mary Jo Morahan of Plymouth was among 18 students attending an overseas studies program in Britain this summer offered through Michigan State University.

The course in contemporary mass media held in London July 10-Aug. 4 included visits to the London Times and Guardian newspapers and trips to the British Broadcasting Corp. (BBC).

The program gives participants the chance to study the present status of print, film and broadcast media in Britain and to see their operations and interrelationships. Students also studied advertising, audience research, and new technology.

Ms. Morahan, daughter of Mr. and

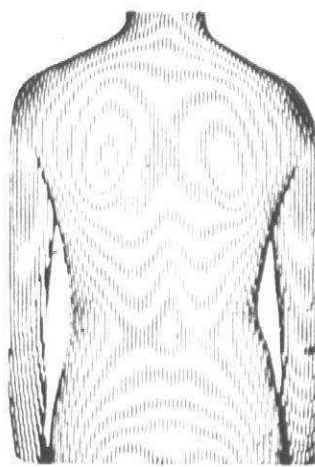
Mrs. Roger Morahan of Spicer Drive, Plymouth, is a 1976 graduate of Plymouth Canton High.

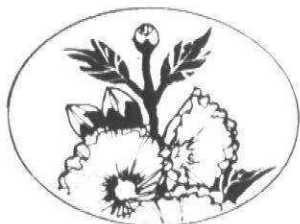

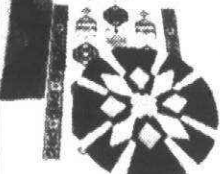

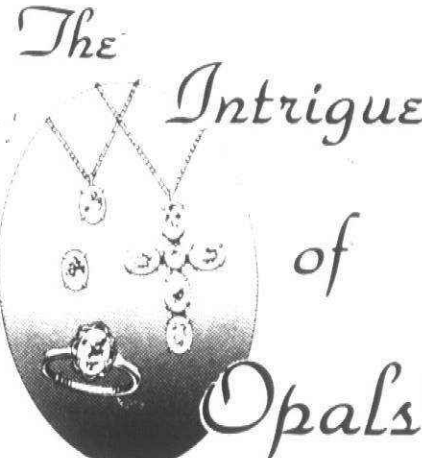

Raiders roll over Thurston

The Redford Thurston Eagles, which soared to victory during their first two football games of the season, were shot down last weekend by North Farmington, 42-0.

Very little went right for Thurston on either side of the scrimmage line.

North scored one touchdown during each of the other three periods.

Goldstein sneaked in from one yard out in the second quarter. Tom Herrington caught a six-yard pass from Goldstein in the third and Dan Cohen returned an intercepted pass 32 yards in the fourth.

Jeff Cohen, a hard-driving ball-carrier, accumulated 101 yards on 11 rushes.

The Eagles may have lost the services of one of their better linemen for the rest of the season. Jeff Stankiewicz sustained a shoulder injury, the severity of which was not known at

press time.

In spite of the one-sided loss, Riehl could point to a couple of bright spots in his charges' performance.

"Richard Rudd, a sophomore tail-back, ran well and punted well for us," said the coach. Rudd started in place of the injured Mark Erickson.

"Bob Livingston, a defensive lineman, played another good game, or as good as you can when you lose 42-0," Riehl continued.

"Our turnovers were much better and we had fewer penalties. We just couldn't stay with them. Physically, we lost. Mentally, we'll just have to come back," said Riehl.

The Eagles will have that opportunity 2 p.m. Saturday when they battle Livonia Franklin at Franklin.

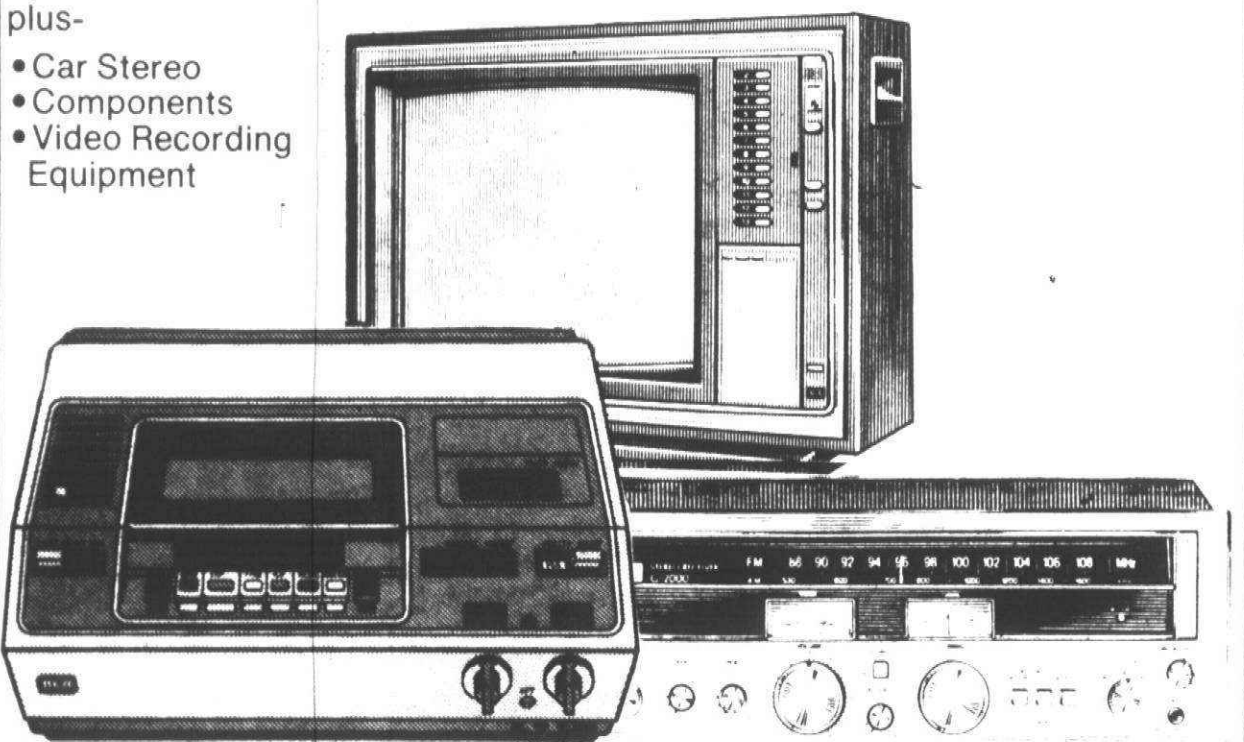

Mudslinging can backfire

October usually marks the beginning of a concerted effort by political candidates to garner votes for the November general election.

There is a marked tendency for some candidates to assume the best way to win an election is to smear mud on their opponents.

Every now and again someone actually comes up with a legitimate and important piece of information about another candidate that the public should know about.

More often, the information is either petty or exaggerated.

In Canton Township, as in other communities facing elections, the art of mudslinging has reached a staggering height of quantity, if not quality.

The accusations and insults flying back and forth provide a great deal of entertainment for those who aren't actually involved in the bloody political arena.

Mudslinging tends to keep the current administration under close scrutiny, which never hurts.

It tends to keep political candidates in line, because their every movement is so closely monitored.

Mudslinging also tends to create a tangled thicket in which the voters can't see the forest for the trees.

WE HAVE seen a sad dearth of something in this election.

The missing element is called issues. It's not that Canton lacks issues.

This is a township suffering from growing pains. The land developments rights purchase millage question will be on the November ballot.

Important as this issue is, candidates have been more inclined to attack opponents motives for their positions on any and all issues.

Taxes, and reductions thereof, will have a prominent spot on the ballot. Few candidates will actually take a stand against these proposals, especially the Headlee amendment.

How candidates feel about these issues isn't all that important, because this time it's up to the voters.

But we haven't noticed anyone attempting to come up with constructive plans to keep Canton solvent should either of these amendments pass.

There are going to have to be some alternative plans of what to cut and how to do it. Taking stands supporting the taxpayers doesn't achieve that goal. It's just political rhetoric.

The fault is partially with the politicians, for believing the voters don't have enough intelligence to do anything but vote for the person who dug up the most dirt against his or her opponent.

The fault lies with the voters as well, if they choose not to demand that these candidates provide evidence of their own competency rather than the incompetency of others.

Newspapers must also take their share of the blame if they allow themselves to be blinded by exposes and denunciations at the expense of issues.

If the facts are there pointing to someone's wrongdoing, we should print it.

But no one involved in an election should grow blinders, lest our eyes become so filled with mud that we can no longer see its source.

Glories of cider

Hawaii may have its pineapples and Florida its oranges, but Michigan has the best fruit and best drink concoction of all—glorious apple cider.

In an earlier era, every farm had its apple tree or apple orchard, and most had simple cider presses. But with specialization came the commercial cider mill, which used to press peaches and grapes and other fruit, too, in bygone times.

The clear, pasteurized stuff you get in the grocery store has a preservative, and you can have it if you want. The real stuff is a murky color, has more "body" and in a couple of weeks will ferment and turn to applejack, a low-alcohol apple wine.

Around most houses, though, cider doesn't last too long once you bring it home. Everybody's always grabbing a sip before it turns hard.

Michigan is America's No. 3 apple producing state and first in producing two of the best cider apples, Jonathons and Northern Spies. At last count, 110 cider mills were producing.

Michigan is also a good spot for cider mills, just as it was for sawmills, because our rivers provide plenty of water power. The Wolverine State has had few log cabins and vast quantities of cider because there were so many sawmills and cider mills.

There are many picturesque, old-fashioned cider mills where you can take a carload of family on a Sunday, but don't plan to buy your year's supply there because their prices are considerably higher than less picturesque places that produce equal quality cider. And whereas the picturesque spots close with the first snow, the other places continue to press the finest cider of the year well into February.

At intermission the Irish led, 14-13, and Michigan shook thunder from the skies with 19 points in the third quarter.

Tom Kuzma, a halfback from Gary, Ind., who has been a resident of Birmingham for many years, should remember that explosive afternoon quite well, having scored two of the five Michigan touchdowns. Capt. George Ceithaml, Don Robinson and Paul White got the others.

It's from keeping old notes like that around for 36 years that my desk has become such a clutter.

The Stroller

The supersalesman

For more than a half-century, The Stroller has been travelling from one college campus to another across the land during the football season. He has witnessed all sorts of formations and maneuverings on the field, from the flying wedge to the "wishbone," the "I" formation and the "shotgun" lineup.

But the finest maneuvering he has seen didn't take place on the white striped gridirons. And it may be a long time before anything like it happens again.

This fine bit of maneuvering was the work of Don Canham, athletic director of the University of Michigan, whose mental craftiness has made the Wolverines' athletic program the most financially successful in the land.

His latest bit was to "sell" the Irish at Notre Dame the idea of renewing their rivalry that has laid dormant for 35 years. More than that, he sold them the idea of each team in the home-and-home series keeping its own gate receipts.

THIS SOUNDS simple enough on paper. But when you consider that Michigan Stadium seats 104,000 and

South Bend's 59,000, it is no surprise to hear even the most partisan football fan ask, "How did he do it?"

This was the first thing that came to The Stroller's mind when the renewal of the ancient series and its financial arrangements were made public.

There was only one way to find out: Ask the man himself.

Canham just smiled when the question was put to him. "It was rather easy," he said, "and it isn't as one-sided as it may look."

Then he pointed out that Notre Dame gets \$10 a ticket compared to Michigan's \$8. And Notre Dame has only 17,000 students to take care of at reduced prices compared to 35,000 at Michigan.

"When you figure that out, you'll find the money comes out about even," he said.

THERE WAS a glint in his eye as he spoke, and The Stroller felt there was more to the unusual arrangement than that—especially since both sides agreed to continue the series, save for two years in the 1980s, until 1990.

Since then, both schools have agreed to a pact whereby the home team pays the visitors \$10,000. But even with that,

New scapegoat for high taxes

Headlee, Tisch and the voucher people are brimming with cheap shots at "bureaucrats" and "politicians" as the reason for high taxes. Either they don't know who is to blame or they are afraid to say.

I offer a new and more logical scapegoat. It's the construction industry, and nowhere was it more apparent than in last week's State Senate debate over whether to hike gasoline, diesel fuel and weight taxes.

Remember that most state taxes have been relatively stable during the 1970s. There was a hiccup in the personal income tax. Excise taxes have changed little. Sales taxes on food and drugs were actually removed. The single business tax? Well, that is admittedly messy.

IN LANSING, our friendly local legislators are debating whether to pump \$168.5 million in new money into all forms of transportation. If it passes, roads and other forms of transportation would all have their funds beefed by about 25 per cent.

The Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority—which the uninformed refer to as "mass transit"—would get only about 12 per cent of that new pot. Most of the rest would go to roads—highways, county roads, city and village streets.

Realistically, then, the big bucks are going to roads. Why?

Because the construction industry has been so inflationary, that's why. Herewith is an excerpt from the transportation package analysis from the office of State Rep. William Ryan (D-Detroit), its architect and chief sponsor:

"Road construction costs have more than doubled in the past 10 years, while inflation has sharply increased the cost of road maintenance, for laborers as well as for basic materials such as asphalt.

"Further, because of better automobile fuel economy and a decline in the average weight of cars, motor vehicle fund monies have leveled off and have not kept pace with inflation."

THE ST. JOSEPH County Road Commission said in written testimony:

"The financial crunch began in 1973-74. Prices we paid for materials, equipment and labor increased dramatically." In the five years from 1973-78, it found:

- Asphalt had tripled in price.
- Grader blades had nearly doubled.
- Insurance had tripled.
- Wages were up 31 per cent.
- But revenues were up only 15 per cent.

Discussing state taxes, Sen. Robert Vanderlaan (R-Kentwood) compared the taxes he paid on comparable 1974 and 1978 Oldsmobiles. Because the new Olds is lighter and gets 20 mpg instead of 15, he figures his total taxes—even with the proposed increases—are actually less for the new car.

REMEMBER THAT much of the money we give the state for roads is actually paid out to private contractors and manufacturers. "Bureaucrats" don't pave our roads.

The construction industry is probably the most inflationary industry in the country. And the chief economist for the National Association of Home Builders said the cost of both new and used houses will rise 12 to 14 per cent again next year. So even if you vote down millage rates, your tax base—the value of your house—will be raised by the construction industry.

Headlee, Tisch and the voucher people are misdirecting their fire. The bureaucrats and politicians are getting too much blame. What Michigan and the nation need is not anti-tax sentiment but anti-construction industry sentiment.

Here, have them check out a resource book on art methods, a book on teaching games in the elementary school, and a record. Once a week, spend 20 minutes introducing and playing a simple game, 10 minutes listening to and singing a new song, and 15 minutes doing a simple art project.

For those teachers who can't draw a straight line, are tone deaf and physically uncoordinated, keep in mind that the creativity is expected to come from the children and the experts who have written the resource books. The teacher's responsibility in these specialized areas would be that of director.

An additional thought on fund-saving: movie projectors, film strip projectors, overhead projectors, tape recorders, listen-posts, etc. are very nice to have and use. They also are very expensive. Good learning can take place with a teacher, a pupil and a few rudimentary materials, the most

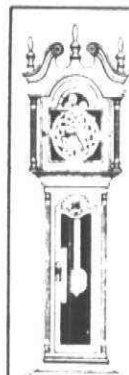
important factors in the learning process being the teacher and the pupil. Granted, today's society is growing ever more specialized and mechanized, but let us take care lest we lose that most important human factor.

My first grader had the privilege of being exposed to an art specialist, a music specialist, a physical education specialist, a humanities specialist, an art appreciation specialist and an interesting array of teaching machines.

On one occasion I went to pick him up early from school and found his classroom empty. The office directed me to his teacher who told me he was having "story time." I found my son in the "media center" sitting in front of a screen while a "media specialist" ran a film through a projector. This is but one example in which I found my son's education to be specialized and mechanized. This type of education is necessarily expensive. The question arises, is this type of education necessary?

Perhaps our basic educational structure needs to be evaluated and replaced with something that is just as effective but less costly.

BPW celebrates 50th anniversary

Anniversaries are times for reminiscing. So it was Saturday evening when the Plymouth Business and Professional Women's Club celebrated the golden anniversary of its founding with a dinner party at the Plymouth Hilton Inn.

Mary Jane Peck had compiled the history of the club from old scrapbooks, programs and newspaper clippings. There were 17 charter members when the club was formed Sept. 25, 1928. Norma Cassidy, is the only charter member still active in the club.

Mrs. Peck told members and guests that a newspaper article, dated 1928, revealed the president of the education division of the Michigan Narcotics Association had been guest speaker at a BPW meeting. His subject was "The Drug Addict and his Problem." The gist of his talk emphasized the real lack of information available to drug users.

National Business Women's Week,

March 10-15, 1930, had front page coverage in the March 14 issue of the Plymouth Mail. Bell Telephone was acclaimed as the employer of "the largest organization of women ever assembled." It continued: "... as demands on the company increase each year, these demands are met by the women."

PHOEBE PATTERSON, first woman justice of the peace in Michigan was a charter member of the Plymouth BPW.

She received statewide attention when a Detroit lawyer challenged the right of a woman to be a judge. The case went to the Supreme Court which upheld Judge Patterson's right to be a JP. She continued at her post for 11 years and died during her 12th year in office.

Another member, Ruth Huston Whipple, was the first woman mayor of the City of Plymouth. She also was the first woman to be a member of the

Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Among the club's clippings was a story about Mrs. Whipple, author of the book "Debating in High School."

AS far back as 1932, BPW members were concerned about child abuse.

SLOGAN FOR National Business Women's Week in 1934 was "Jobs for 10,000."

Eleanor Roosevelt, wife of the president and an honorary member of the business women's federation, announced the goal in a nationwide broadcast. She also promised to announce the result of the drive to employ "10,000 white collar women."

Fifty years ago there were 130 clubs in the nation with 5,400 members. Now, there are 3,709 clubs with 162,285 members.

The Plymouth club awarded its first scholarship to a high school senior in 1934. Scholarships have continued to be its most important project. The number of grants and the amount of money have increased over the years, reflecting the success of their fund-raising efforts.

SCHOLARSHIPS and other philanthropies are financed by fashion shows, the sale of calendars and other club projects.

For years, BPW members served a German dinner the Thursday of Plymouth Fall Festival. The smell of sauerkraut and knackwurst filled Kellogg Park and the downtown area as the women served hundreds of diners. They fought flies and bees attracted by the dozens of homemade German chocolate cakes. Seldom was the weather ideal—they worked in heat, cold, and sometimes rain.

They finally decided there must be an easier way to make money. They gave up the German dinner and for the past two years have rented a booth where they sold hundreds of dozens of homemade cookies during the festival. There was the first Christmas party when Norma Cassidy wore a Santa Claus suit.

There were floats in Fourth of July parades. The year they chose a Hawaiian theme was recalled at the banquet. Their skimpy crepe paper grass skirts were no protection from low temperatures. Even the dry ice, which was supposed to create a misty atmosphere, refused to steam in the cold.

MARY BETH PECK told about the national BPW convention in 1963. She was a delegate to the July meeting in Dallas.

Among the members of the host club was a lady who worked on the chuckwagon, took part in the entertainment. She wore blue jeans and a red bandana and was the type who left a lasting impression.

The delegates saw her again in November. This time it was on television when BPW member Judge Sarah T. Hughes administered the oath of office to the new President Lyndon Johnson.

Winner of the Plymouth Political Service award is announced each year at the BPW state convention. It goes to a Michigan woman for outstanding service in an elective or political office.

Another major annual event is Bosses Night, a dinner party with a special guest speaker. The women have hosted the party for their employers for more than 20 years.

NORMA CASSADY expressed her disappointment that Sarah Gayde, another charter member, was unable to attend the golden anniversary party.

She reminisced briefly about her childhood days in the village of Plymouth. She told about walking to school on the wooden sidewalks and jumping to the safety of front lawns when a horse and buggy went by to escape mud splatters on their clean pinafores.

She told a story about one of the two ministers in town. He was making the rounds of the households—trying to encourage the residents to attend church. He became involved in a conversation with a gentleman who obviously was disinterested in church-going.

The preacher was not above using a few scare tactics to prove his point. He pointed out that Judgment Day was approaching and the man should prepare himself.

"When do you think it will be?" asked the householder.

"It could be today. It could be tomorrow," replied the minister.

"Don't tell my wife," begged the man. "She'll want to go both days."

PLYMOUTH MAYOR Tom Turner issued a Proclamation designating "Sept. 24, 1978, as a day to honor Business and Professional Women of our community and hereby pay tribute to this organization for their accomplishments as they celebrate their 50th anniversary."

Among the guests of honor at the celebration were: U.S. Rep. and Mrs. Carl Pursell, State Sen. and Mrs. Robert Geake, District Judge and Mrs. Dunbar Davis, and from Plymouth Township, Treasurer and Mrs. Joe West and Supervisor and Mrs. Tom Notebaert.

The BPW was represented by Madeline Vick, past state president; Mary Esther Dadazzo, immediate past president; Marlene Danol, first vice president; Maybelle Shon, bylaw chairman; Charlotte Adams, state public relations chairman; Mary Williams, District 10 director; Grace Rix, District 9 director; and representatives from neighboring chapters.

They dined on prime rib followed by an immense 50th birthday cake.

Guest speaker was Henry Washington of Quanex Standard Tube. Musical entertainment was provided by a Sweet Adelines barber shop quartet.

The caucus hopes to attract the woman who might want to run for public office, the woman who is sure there is more to politics than stuffing envelopes and making coffee and the woman who wants to become politically involved.

The event will feature Libby Maynard, Democratic candidate for lieutenant governor. Appearing with her will be a panel of five women who will talk on a variety of subjects.

They include Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Alice Gilbert, a candidate for the state Supreme Court; Sarah Power, University of Michigan Regent; Lavon Bliesener, director of women's office for Gov. William Milliken and a member of the Michigan Women's Political Caucus.

The caucus' aims to get women involved in the political process, and it is trying to establish a talent bank of women whose names can be submitted when appointments to public office are to be made. It has also prepared a booklet listing appointive offices at city, county, township and state levels.

The second congressional district includes parts of Wayne and Washtenaw counties and most of Monroe County. It includes Livonia, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and

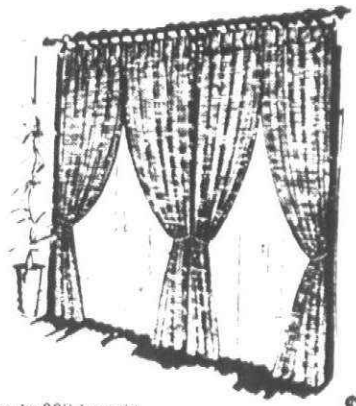

Program aimed at new mothers

By PATRICIA LaCROIX

"Before the birth, all the attention is focused on the pregnancy and pre natal care. Then, afterwards, all the attention is focused on the baby."

"But the mother still needs attention and still has her own needs to be filled. That is what we are all about," said social worker Mary Schuman.

Ms. Schuman, along with Joyce Cunningham, are coordinating a program designed to meet the needs of new mothers. It is offered through the Plymouth Family Services agency.

The program is directed toward women who have had a child in the past year. Ms. Schuman said it is important that people do not view it as a "therapy session" and that people don't need to have a problem to enroll.

It more of a "growth group."

The program is designed to help women fulfill themselves, cope with the tensions and fatigue and enrich their marriage through the child after the birth.

"They generally talk about the things that they want to," she said. This could include topics such as the complications of having a second child, returning to work after the birth and discipline of children.

"There is just a whole overall adjustment after that point (of the birth). The women have stopped work, if they were working before, and now they are home for a good deal of the time."

"There are feelings of isolation, and the group helps these women get over them."

In addition to the feelings of isolation, there also can be feelings of jealousy, she explained, since the father may spend more time with the baby than the mother.

"It is a whole family reorganization. The parents have to find time for themselves and for each other," she said. "Before the birth, there may not have been anything that cut into their time so much."

The program will run eight consecutive weeks, beginning Oct. 12. The sessions are held from 10:30 to noon on Thursdays. Registration fee is \$20. Interested people should contact the agency at 453-0890 for more information.

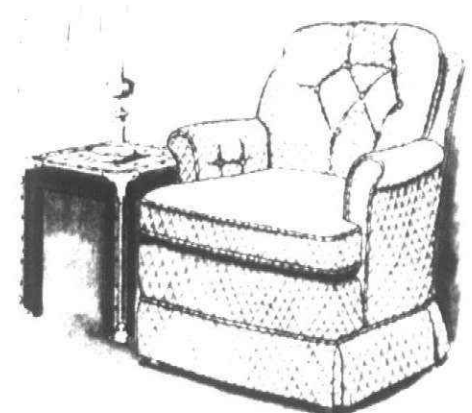

She has performed in opera, theater and with orchestras, most recently with the St. Louis Symphony. She was a finalist in both the Metropolitan and American Opera auditions.

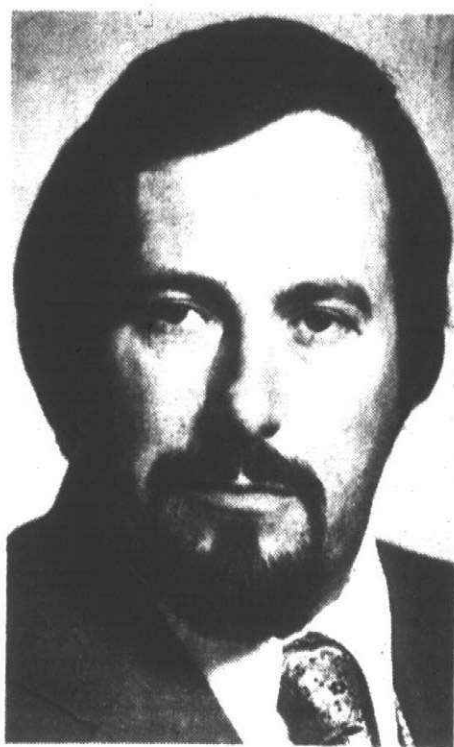

"The Crucible," Arthur Miller's American classic concerning the Salem witch trials, has been slated as the Bonstelle Theatre's season opener.

The drama will be presented at 8:30 p.m. on Oct. 13, 14, 20 and 21 and at 2 p.m. Oct. 15 and 22.

Written in response to Miller's personal experience with the McCarthy hearings during the 1950s, "The Crucible" has now emerged as more than a topical drama of that time.

It continues to hold the stage as a powerful human tragedy as well as a timeless social drama. The play centers around the life of a common Puritan farmer, John Proctor, an innocent victim of the witchcraft hysteria who finds the strength to become truly heroic.

DIRECTOR SPENCER Golub said, "This production is not a strict historical piece. It deals with evils which are tendencies in all human nature. We are attempting to get at the mental set of the society and help an audience understand how something like this could have easily happened."

Golub, director of the successful 1978 Studio Theatre production of "The Possessed," continued, "Too often people forget that the Puritans were trying to create a warm spot in the middle of the wilderness and that left them very vulnerable to things like superstition."

The Bonstelle cast is headed by Richard Buzinski of New Baltimore as John Proctor, Cheryl Risley of Roseville as his wife Elizabeth, and Maryann Ferenc of Detroit as the young

girl who vengefully accused them of witchcraft.

Other principal roles are played by Philip Fox of Detroit as Deputy-Governor Danforth, Kim Cook of Westland as Mary Warren and Neil E. Martin of Warren in the role of Reverend Hale.

Settings for the production are designed by Blair Vaughn Anderson, costumes by Marilyn Renaud and lighting by Reid G. Johnson.

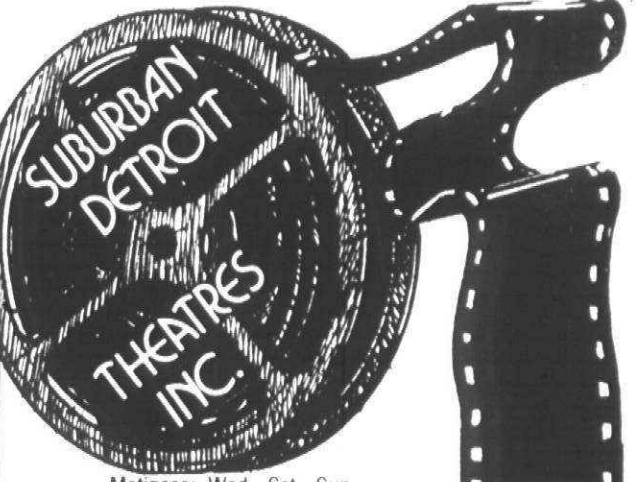

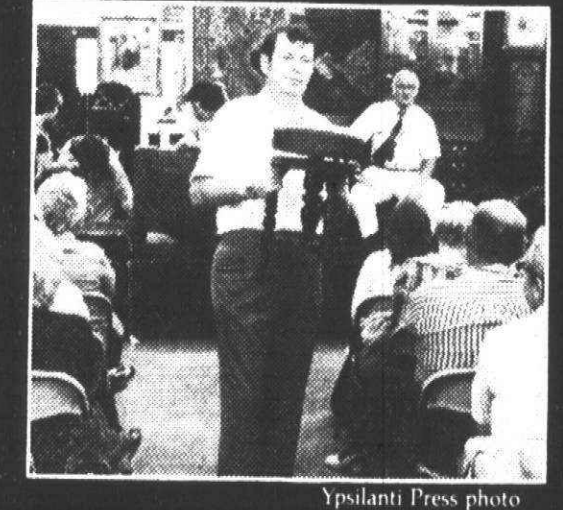

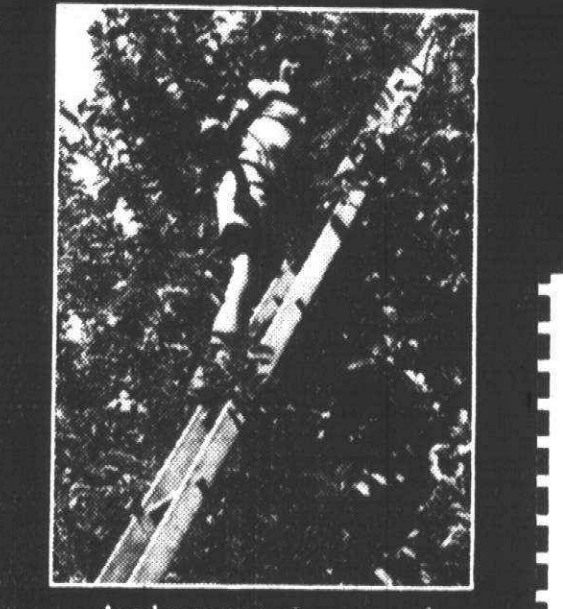

"I walked by the old theater and saw it was closed for remodeling. So I talked to the lady who owned it and told her of the dream I had. It turned out she and her husband had the same dream."

And on Oct. 14 Andrew Henderson's dream will come true. The former Northville P&A Theater at 133 E. Main will reopen as a plush, legitimate Marquis Theater.

It will feature Lerner & Loewe's Broadway musical "Camelot" for the weekends of Oct. 14-15, 20-22 and 27-29 with full cast, settings and a 20-piece orchestra.

Other offerings this season will be ballet, marionette theater and theater for children. In between live offerings, the Marquis will continue to show motion pictures.

HENDERSON MAKES his living selling pianos and is also known locally as former harpist and assistant conductor of the Oakway Symphony Orchestra. His wife, Lin, is a ballerina and ballet teacher.

But he has also been involved in staging and production—and that is what his dream was about.

The couple who shared the early dream are Jay and Inge Zaytis, who own the theater building and some shops in it.

"The theater was built in 1925 by Penniman and Allen of Plymouth, and it hosted live shows as well as films," Henderson said. "It has a nice orchestra pit that was covered up by the

movie screen. And the acoustics are just excellent."

He added that during the renovation, the original movie screen, autographed by Charlie Chaplin, was found stored away.

THE ZAYTIS are putting in new seats—the same kind as in the Grand Ol' Opry in Nashville and by the company that supplied Kennedy Center in Washington; six new Winsburg brass chandeliers which hold 20 candles each; new heating and air-conditioning

systems; plush velvet draperies, new carpeting and paint.

Six coats of paint were stripped off the old box office, and beautiful black walnut wood was found underneath. It's in a Victorian style.

The opening weekend will be a champagne reception. The ticket reservation number is 349-8110. All 500 seats are unreserved.

PUTTING ON live theater requires a major organizing effort. A production company with four divisions is the vehicle.

The parent organization is Performing Artists Unlimited, a corporation. Divisions are:

- Premin-Henderson Productions, a stock company specializing in staging musicals. Principals are Henderson and William Premin, known to metropolitan audiences for his lead role in "Fiddler on the Roof."

- Forsythe Chamber Ballet, with Lin Henderson as artistic director and choreographer. Mrs. Henderson had her own loft theater on New York's City's Forsythe Street, which is the source of the name. She helped stage Oakway's "Midsummer Night's Dream" and "Italian Spectacular" last season.

- Marquis Marionettes, with Andrew as director. This effort was once part of the Forsythe Theater in New York. He has done marionette shows for both the Livonia-Redford Theater Guild and the Livonia Parks and Recreation Department.

'Sound of Music' in U-M production

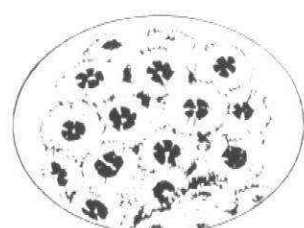

Jewish holidays welcome in new year

The year 5739 will be ushered in by the Jewish festival of Rosh Hashana starting at sundown Sunday, Oct. 1.

Many area Jews will observe the occasion in the Livonia Jewish Congregation, 31840 Seven Mile, Livonia, the only synagogue in western Wayne County.

The ceremony will begin with three blasts on the ram's horn (shofar), an instrument that dates back to the oldest days of Jewish history. It will be sounded at sundown, Oct. 1. Services will also be held at 8 a.m. Monday and Tuesday.

The authority for Rosh Hashana comes from a chapter in Leviticus. "The first day of the seventh month (of the Hebrew calendar) is a solemn time for all people to meet together for worship."

"It is a time of remembrance, and is to be announced by loud blowing of trumpets. Don't do any work on the day of the celebration, but offer a sacrifice by fire to the Lord."

The two-day observance is a time when Jews are supposed to examine their lives and their goals. It begins a 10-day period of repentance ending

with the high holiday of Yom Kippur Oct. 10 and 11. This holiday begins at 7 p.m. Tuesday, and again at 8 a.m. Wednesday and lasts all day. It is a day spent fasting and praying.

Rosh Hashana is both serious and festive with Jewish families enjoying a special meal of apple dipped in honey as they ask for a good and sweet year.

The words Rosh Hashana mean head of the year, which is Hebrew for "new year." According to the Jewish Community Council of Metropolitan Detroit, the two-day event is the result of some uncertainty in the method in ancient Israel of determining the onset of the new moon.

The present Jewish calendar was introduced by the scholar Hillel II in the fourth century. Prior to that the new months were proclaimed by the high court in Jerusalem upon the observation of the reappearance of the crescent moon.

If the new moon was not seen at the normal time of the month, it was automatically celebrated on the next day. Messengers were sent to outlying areas with the news of the new moon, but some communities began the custom of celebrating both days.

Although in the Bible, Rosh Hashana lasted one day only, the two-day festival arose out of the difficulty of determining when the moon actually appeared.

According to tradition the day commemorates the day the world was created.

In Jewish homes on Rosh Hashana candles are lit and a festive meal is held. People greet each other with the words: "May you be inscribed in the book of life for a good year." It has also become customary to send Jewish New Year cards.

In the Livonia Jewish Congregation, services will be conducted by its rabbi, Martin Gordon.

Westland to get Health-O-Rama

Free health screening tests will be available to adults during the United Foundation Health-O-Rama, from 9:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Monday, Oct. 2 through Thursday Oct. 5 at Westland shopping center.

Sponsored by United Health Organization, a Torch Drive-supported service, and Women for the United Foundation, tests will be available to detect signs of high blood pressure, cervical cancer, anemia, heart disease, kidney disease, hearing and vision loss.

Individuals whose test results are abnormal for any phase of screening will be referred to physicians for more precise tests and examination.

Health-O-Rama provides free medical testing to persons 18 or over. Medical tests are conducted by qualified medical personnel who volunteer their time. Mrs. Robert Harkness of Farmington Hills will serve as chairman, assisted by Mrs. Dale Young of Ann Arbor and Mrs. E.J. Alban, Jr., of Dearborn as co-chairmen. They will be assisted by 100 Women for the United Foundation volunteers.

Of the 7,000 people who attended last year, over 30 per cent had not had a complete physical in more than five years. Health-O-Rama does not take

the place of a complete physical examination.

The most common problem detected at Health-O-Rama is obesity. Referrals are made to the Michigan Heart Association, a Torch Drive agency, which offers diet classes to those who are overweight.

"Health-O-Rama is not a medical treatment program," Bill Harsen, Health-O-Rama coordinator said. "It is a medical screening program designed to detect early disease in persons who may be unaware of any health problem."

"Many diseases give few, if any warning signs. That's why it's important to have regular medical check-ups. We hope the United Foundation Health-O-Rama will encourage people to do this."

In addition to the health tests, there will be educational exhibits focusing on health and social problems from Community Information Service, another Torch Drive-supported service. These exhibits will include information on alcoholism, the aged, speech and hearing difficulties, money management, legal aid, camps and recreation services.

Journalist to view First Amendment

Jack C. Landau, journalist and attorney whose job is to watch over the press' freedom-of-information rights, will keynote the national meeting of Women in Communications, Inc. (WICI), in Detroit Thursday, Oct. 12.

Exploring the question, "Is the First Amendment in Danger?" Landau, formerly with Newhouse Newspapers and now executive director of the Reporters Committee for Freedom of the Press, Washington, will speak at the opening luncheon of WICI's 46th annual meeting at the Detroit Plaza Hotel in Renaissance Center.

Landau says the basic interest of the reporters committee is to see that information is made available to the press and public. The committee was founded in 1970 as a clearing house of

information on press related litigation and to help finance legal costs of newspapers in their fight against gag orders, prior restraint and forced revealing of confidential sources.

Other key speakers will be Jane Trahey, author of the successful book, "Jane Trahey on Women and Power," published in 1977, and Nina Totenberg, legal affairs correspondent for National Public Radio, Washington.

Ms. Trahey, president of Trahey Advertising, Inc., New York and Chicago, will speak at the traditional Matrx dinner Saturday, Oct. 14. Ms. Totenberg, who appears regularly on NPR's news program, "All Things Considered," will discuss recent Supreme Court rulings at the closing brunch Sunday, Oct. 15.

ALSO HIGHLIGHTED will be the five recipients of WICI's 1978 Headliner Awards: Christy C. Bulkeley, publisher of the Danville, Ill., Commercial-News, a Gannett Company newspaper; John Mack Carter, editor of Good Housekeeping magazine; Mary A. Gardner, professor of journalism at Michigan State University; Irma Kalish, Tandem Productions, Los Angeles, executive producer of "Good Times" and other television shows; and Barbara Gardner Proctor, owner of Proctor & Gardner Advertising, Chicago. Each is scheduled to speak briefly Thursday night, at the headliner dinner and later in the week at seminars.

The Headliner Award, the highest honor WICI pays its members, was

first given in 1939. Carter, one of the 1978 recipients, and Allen Neuharth, Rochester, N.Y., president and chief executive officer of the Gannett Company, a 1977 recipient, are the only men ever to receive the honor.

Professional workshops and seminars scheduled during the four-day meeting provide a choice of 22 subjects. Two of the seminars—one on communications technology and the other on time management—will offer credit in Continuing Education Units.

The communications technology course will include "Interactive Television Systems" by Peter Clarke of the University of Michigan and sessions on information retrieval systems, the use of audiovisuals, and the effect of electronic news gathering on public relations practices.

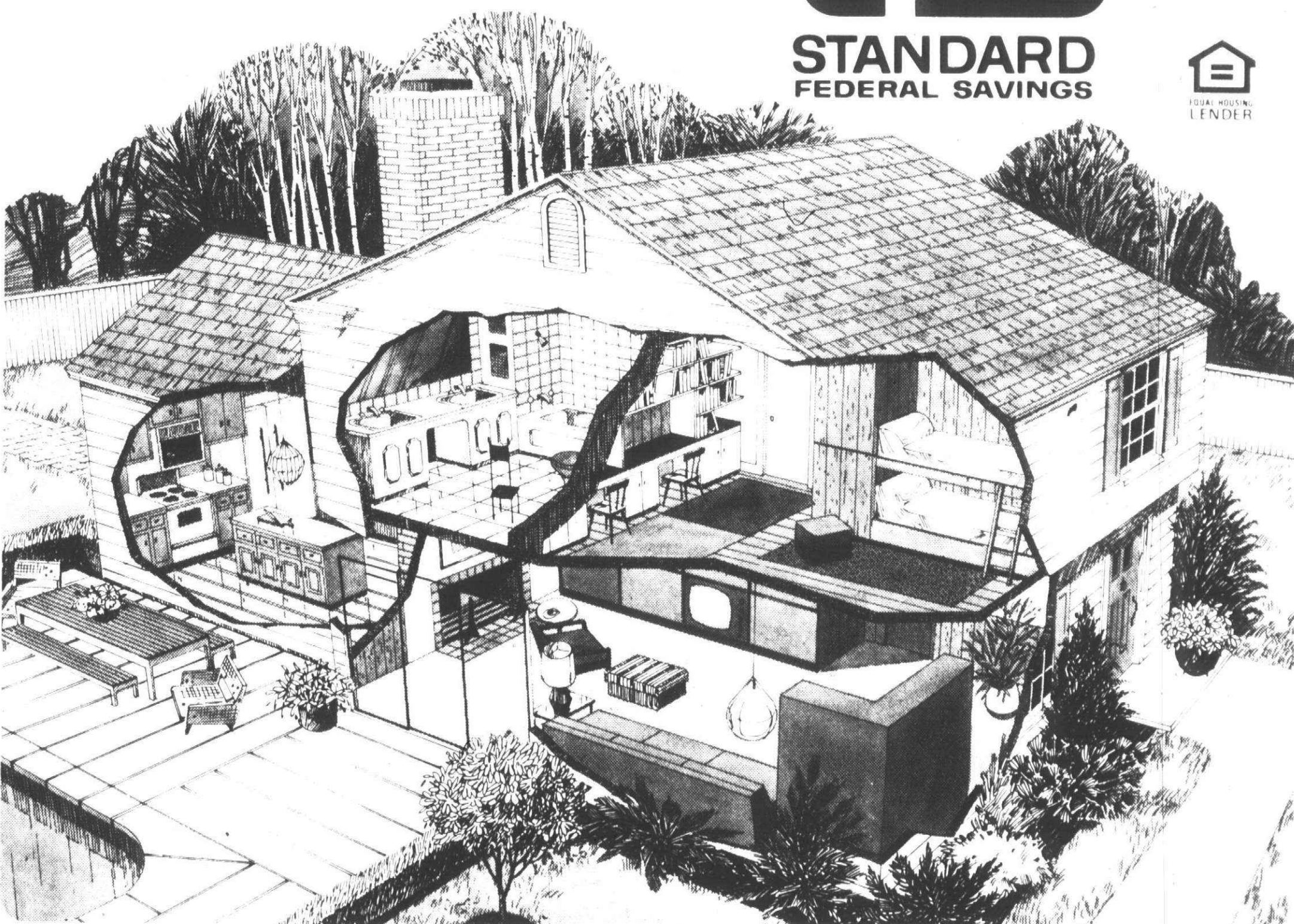

Rocks edge RU; Canton clips Stevenson

Plymouth Salem fought off its stiffest challenge of the young season by turning back a stubborn Redford Union girls basketball squad, 56-51, Tuesday night at the Salem gymnasium.

Redford Union's Nancy Lawson took game scoring honors with 14 points. Betty Owens added 11, while Micki McLalin chipped in with 10.

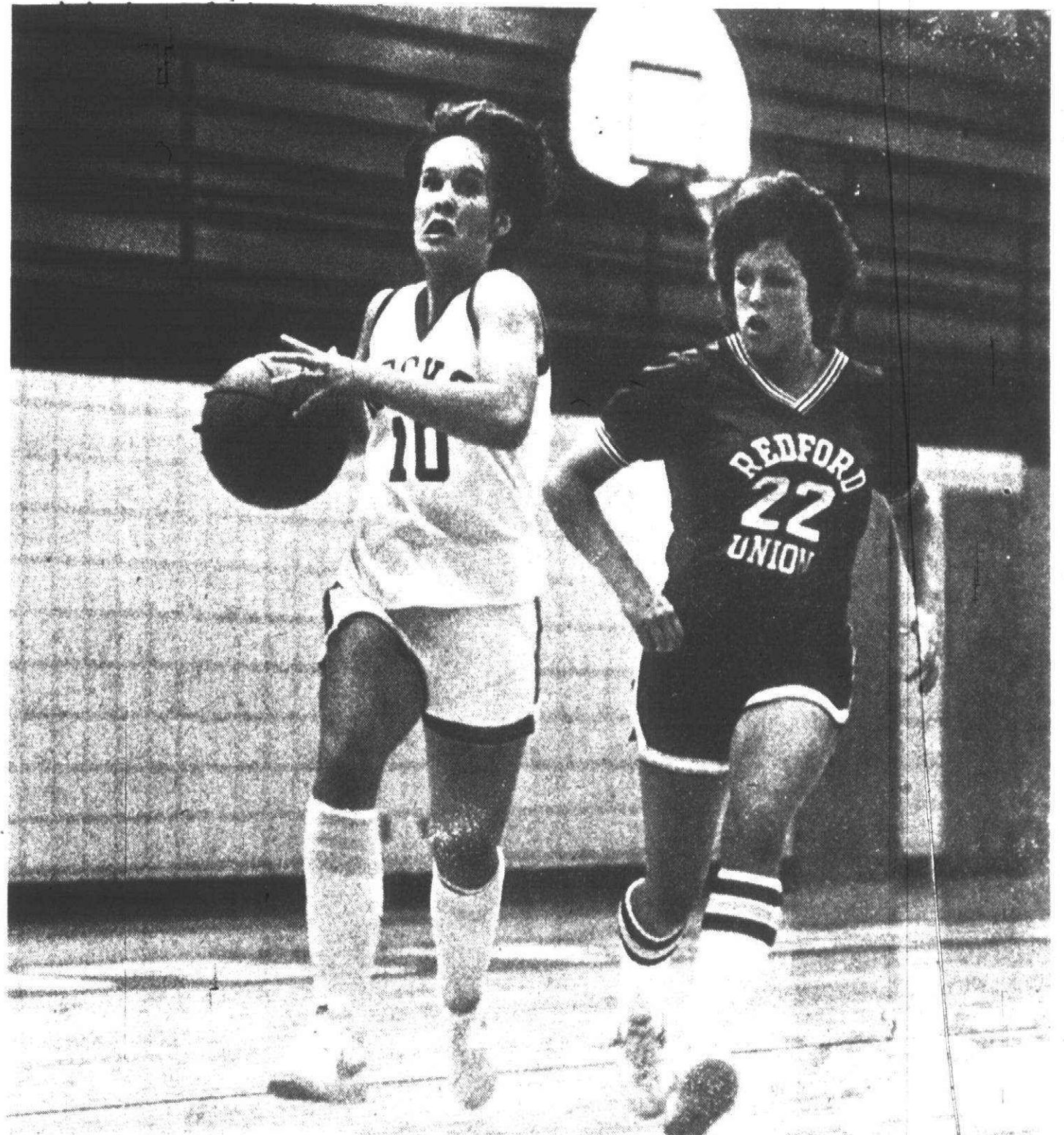
Salem hosts non-league foe Ann Arbor Huron tonight at 8 p.m.

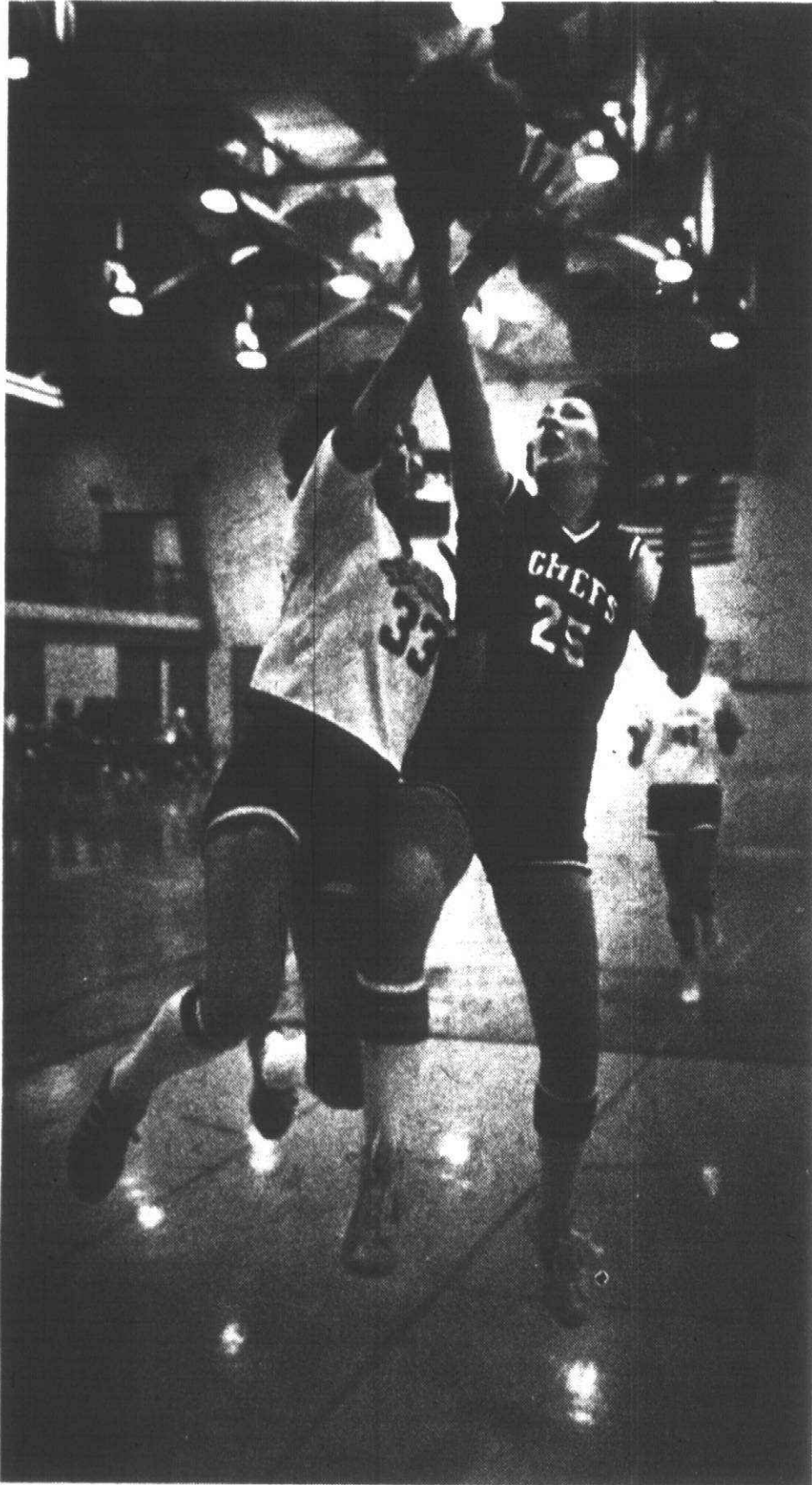
Canton coach Mike McCauley called it an "aggressive but sloppy" victory for his unbeaten Chiefs, who have now won three consecutive games.

Salem netters trim Trenton

Coach Jan Lawson and her Plymouth Salem girls tennis team waited four long years before their dream came true in defeating Suburban Eight League rival Trenton in dual meet action.

And the match wasn't even close, as the upstart Salem netters trounced the Trojans 5-2 Monday afternoon at Trenton.

The victory all but paves the way for the Rocks to win yet another Sub-8 title. Salem has never finished below second place in league standings in the nine-year history of the sport.

Salem faces lowly Belleville; Canton regroups

Only one-third of the prep football schedule has been completed. But if the season were to end after the first three weeks of action, Plymouth Salem would once again gain a state playoff berth with its 90.67 playoff-point average. The Rocks are second only to Detroit Catholic Central's 96.00 points in Region 2.

Alas, three games do not make a

season, but it's a reasonable assumption that Salem, that inexperienced, green team in late August, would make the playoffs if its record stays unblemished.

The Rocks eye win number four tomorrow night when they return home for a Suburban Eight League meeting with winless Belleville starting at 8 p.m.

Plymouth Canton suffered its first setback of the young season last Friday night when the Northville Mus-

tangs dampened the Chiefs' Western Six League opener with a 27-6 decision. Canton's schedule doesn't get any easier this week, as the Chiefs travel to Livonia Churchill tomorrow night for an 7:30 p.m. clash with the unbeaten and state-ranked Chargers.

PLYMOUTH SALEM'S offense came into its own against Allen Park last week, as the big play and crisp execution resulted in an easy 35-6 victory. The Rocks defense, however, let

the Jaguars move the ball too much, according to Rock head coach Tom Moshimer.

While it's obvious the Tigers are "down" this season after getting bombed by Wayne Memorial, Trenton and Dearborn Edsel Ford, the 0-3 squad has experienced the toughest part of its schedule during this time. Salem marks the fourth straight undefeated team the Tigers have played. And with the loss of Calvin Patterson, the Tigers' star running back who transferred to Ypsilanti over the summer, it's easy to see why the Rocks will be heavy favorites to win this game.

"There's no question in our minds that we are a better team than Belleville," said Moshimer. "We're 3-0 and they're 0-3. I feel we should beat them."

"I'm not going to lie to the kids but we have to go out and play good football. They aren't going to fall flat and let us win."

Moshimer says his team must avoid any kind of overconfidence or "looking ahead" attitudes to Redford Union next week.

"We're not ready yet to be over-

confident," the Salem coach said. "We're getting better each week but we still must work to get even better."

Despite the easy victory over Allen Park, Salem made a lot of mental mistakes on the field. Salem could have scored three more touchdowns against the Jaguars if penalties and other miscues were avoided.

"We scored a lot of points and had the big play because we got all the breaks," Moshimer said. "Against Allen Park these (mistakes) didn't hurt, but you can't afford them against a good team."

PLYMOUTH CANTON must regroup after its setback to the Mustangs. In that contest, Northville's Doug Marzone proved to be the difference as the quarterback-linebacker led the Mustangs to the easy victory.

"We got blitz," admitted Chief coach Dave Schuele. "They (Northville) put it together and we looked shabby on defense."

As the Chiefs prepare for state-ranked Livonia Churchill, the main concern on the squad is halfback-linebacker Rusty Mandle, who?

h?yexten who suffered a slight shoulder injury and missed the last quarter of the Northville game. The Chiefs' leading ground gainer is expected to return to the line up against the Chargers tomorrow night.

The Chargers must be considered the team to beat in the Western-6 race after defeating tough non-league foes from East Lansing and Ann Arbor Huron and whalloping loop opponent Walled Lake Western, 41-6, last week.

The experienced Chargers have some 14 returning letter winners in the line up headed by running back Doran Mason.

"They (Churchill) are tough," Schuele said. "They come out and play football with you. They give you nothing fancy."

"We're just going to have to be ready," he said. "We're the type of team that could make the game interesting. We just hope to keep the kids healthy and go into it with a good attitude. We weren't standing around savoring our wins, and we're not going to stand around and cry about our losses."

was beaten 5-7, 1-6 and second singles Eileen McGinn was deprived a win when she lost to Mott in split sets 6-1, 5-7, 4-6.

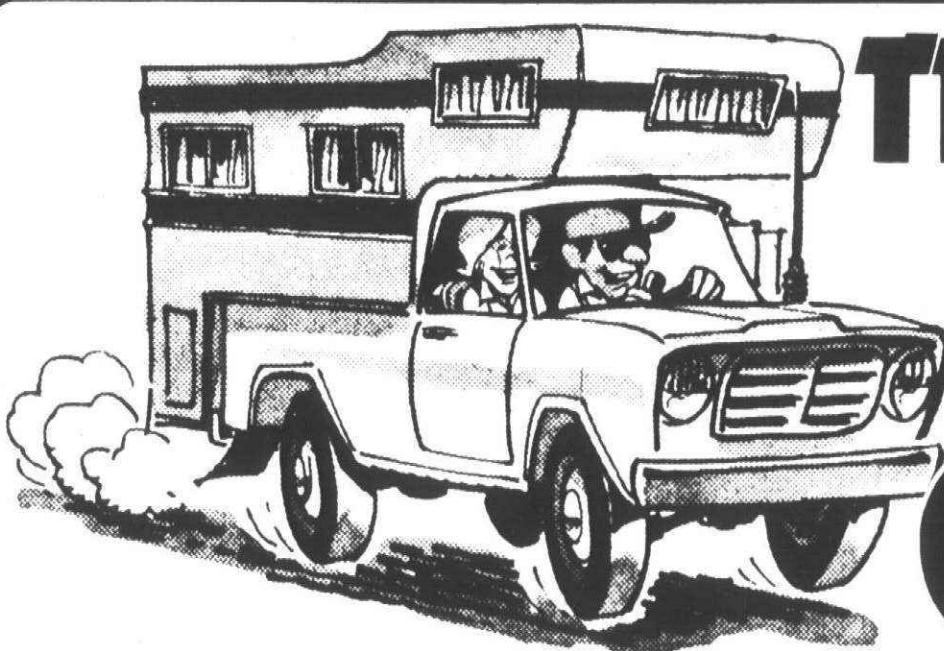
Freshman Ann O'Connell was also kept out of the winning spot light when Mott's fourth singles player took her 2-6, 2-6.

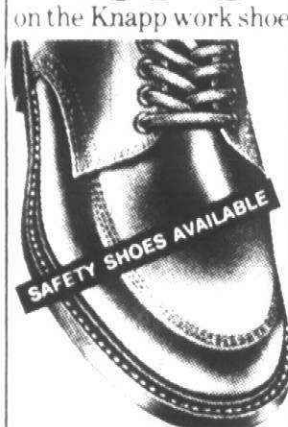
Reardon was the top middle and long distance swimmer, winning both the 200-yard and 500-yard freestyle.

Color flows like soft music

Colors are bewitching. They create moods—some pick you up, others let you down, some calm pent-up anxieties and still others seem to pump fresh energy to weary limbs.

After long hours at their medical practices, Dr. Richard Taras and his wife, Dr. Joan Taras of Bloomfield Hills, open their front door and walk into their private world. The color messages are subtle and reinforcing.

INTERIOR DESIGNER Delphine Michaels of the Curiosity Shoppe in Franklin said as she stood in the living room of the Taras home, "I am a firm believer in flow of color."

Basically she worked with dark brown, lime green, yellow and white. Each room has variations on this color theme.

The deep brown, used lavishly in all rooms, is a firm, rich, secure color. With white, it takes on surprising resiliency.

The lime green and small touches of yellow add the spark that brings the brown alive.

So, here is the color imprint of the home—elegant, quiet, secure, but with fresh, pleasant hints of the outdoors—nothing to jar the psyche, but colors to live with comfortably.

The foyer of the red brick, modified Georgian style home set on rolling terrain is the appetizer.

A **WHITE FLORAL SCENE** on the rich brown background of the custom wall murals seems to literally climb upward and disappear before it reaches the ceiling. White columns in the entry hall add to the classic garden feeling as the living room ahead becomes visible.

The living room is papered in a large floral print, mostly white on deep brown, with touches of lime

green and daffodil yellow. This provides a decisive boldness that nicely misses being aggressive because of the way the rest of the room was handled.

White shutter doors at the two living room windows overlooking the gardens beyond, have louvers 5 1/2 inches deep. These unusually deep louvers are bold, but against the wall print and the high, off-white ceiling of the living room, they give a sense of balance and proportion.

Two dark brown wicker porter chairs flank the classic fireplace. A fine, old, wood and cane Louis XV sofa has lime green cushions.

A sofa is covered with the material matching the wall covering, and a small loveseat is done in deep brown moire. These pieces are a dramatic contrast against the thick, off-white carpeting.

Further quiet drama is provided by the collector's type appointments—a Tiffany mantle clock is bronze and deep green marble. A natural, dark wood architect's desk with top that raises at a slant, adds character to the room. Two Foo dogs by the fireplace and brass and green ferns lend warmth.

The rich brown and off-white are carried to the dining room and although textures change, the color transition is altogether natural. The walls are covered in a muted combination of brown and white.

The rug and window treatment provide the sophistication.

DRAPES THAT frame the window have a gray-mauve iridescent look to them. The sheers from France, beautifully embroidered, soften the sunlight to give an opaque atmosphere.

Mirror-paneled screens, set in wood frames on each side of the windows, contribute to a spacious feeling, although the room is of modest size. Table crystal and silver would stand out in this room as works of art simply because of the purity of the color selection and light.

Mrs. Michaels and her clients added deep crown molding to several rooms, including the living room.

According to the decorator, "It doesn't cost as much as most people would imagine. It is a rich addition to the timeless, classic look she has created."

For even with the numerous Louis XV pieces and the charming antique French benches and tables about the house, there was no attempt to keep it purely period.

More than a single period or a single idea, the house belongs to the parents and children who live there. It has the garden feeling they wanted with the colors they like, and the level of sophistication that suits their style of living and entertaining.

There are several areas for family hobbyists to enjoy their interests, playrooms for children and a wood-paneled family room where everyone can put up feet, enjoy relaxed conversation and still see the many treasures around them.



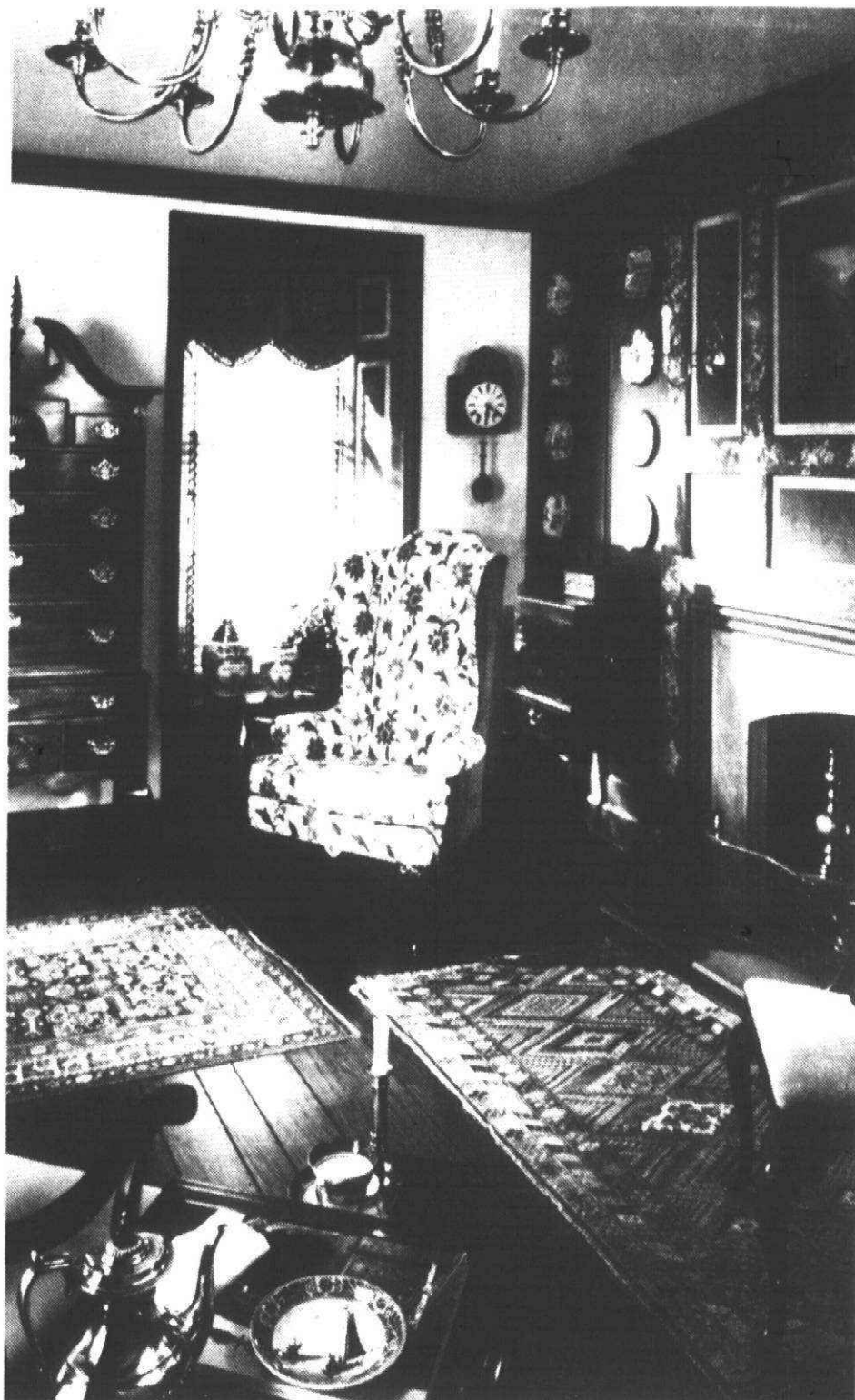

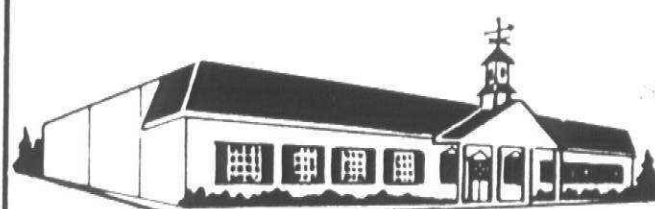

Tradition returns to homes

Cloning. Test tube babies. Genetic breeding. Sex changes. Mutations and mutants.

As science fiction becomes fact, Americans are turning to carriage-post past for stability in a star-ship future.

Having survived and revived the 1950s, designers are now embracing the 1940s, advancing with every backward step. The newest haute of haute couture is Schiaparelli and the seamed stockings and padded shoulders of pre-World War II fashion.

In the home, designers reach for styles of yesterday to satisfy the yearning of today's rootless generation in search of roots.

The antiwar chant of the 1960s, "No, no, we won't go," has become the corporate theme song of the 1970s as executives opt to stay put rather than move to move ahead. According to one survey, one-third to one-half of executives asked to move this year will refuse the transfer.

As settling down becomes the new lifestyle, pads become parlors.

"American traditional may be the hottest new style on the market," said one designer. "Yet who back in the '60s would have ever believed that the jeans and commune generation would grow up and turn on to Queen Anne, Sheraton or Chippendale?"

Notes another designer, "Basic is beautiful, real is right. Quality, value and substance are the important 'buy' words."

"Who with today's double-digit inflation can afford to speculate on fads?"

Even if a house is a contemporary ranch, the trend is to traditional furnishings, said ASID interior designer Pat Plaxico. Ms. Plaxico recently brought the Old World to suburbia with designs from Hickory Furniture Co.'s "American Master-Collection," a group of classics from the 18th century.

From the moldings (these bought from a molding company) to the Oriental rugs and valences at the windows, the room is a faithful recreation of parlors past. A sponge-painted fireplace adds to the feeling of authenticity. There's not a sofa in the room. As in early days, individual chairs serve as seating pieces. And what better solution to create spaciousness in today's space-conscious interiors?

As traditional becomes the new home rule, the four poster returns to star in the bedroom, which is becoming as posh a place as the parlor.

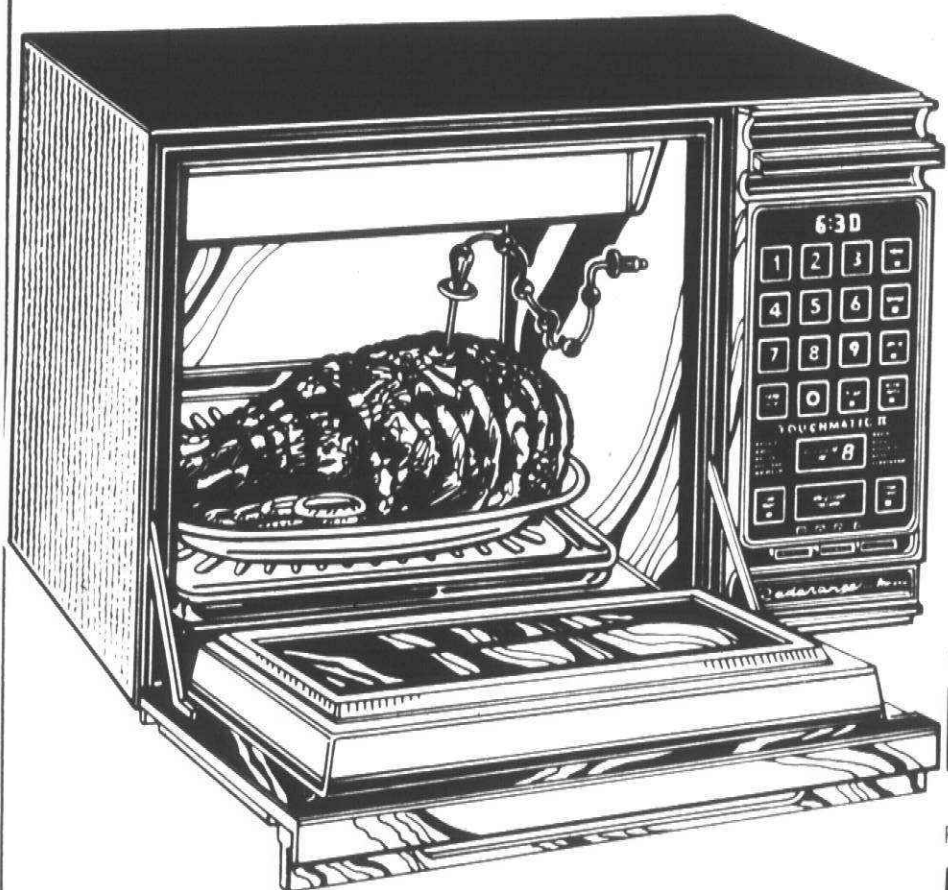
Recent studies show that decorating the bedroom is today's top priority. And as in the living room, the prevailing style is 18th-Century American from bed to wardrobe, including the desk. And, more often than not, say designers, the desk is a key part of the furnishings for work-at-home women.

Times marches backward in time pieces, too. In a world where the computer is becoming commonplace, tall case clocks are going into homes in record numbers.

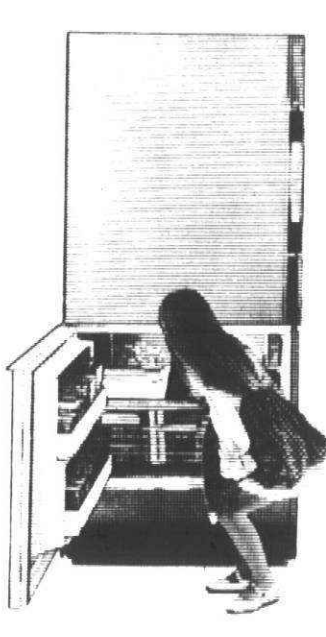

Modern atmosphere — with elegance

Sedate home rejuvenated into nighttime house

It was a pleasant home on a quiet street in a Troy subdivision until an

innovative interior designer and a forward-looking husband and wife team decided to make some dramatic changes.

These young homeowners both work,

so their house needed to come alive in the evenings when they came home to relax and enjoy it.

J.L. Hudson interior designer Gary Vermeulen likes to call it his "night-

time house." The challenge was to create a contemporary atmosphere with an understated elegance that included all kinds of original art, textures, colors and fabrics that displayed well under artificial light plus built-in options for entertaining.

SINCE A great deal of the couple's entertaining is done during the summer, Vermeulen took particular concern with entertainment areas for lazy summer evenings.

A sliding glass door at the rear of the living-dining room area opened onto a small balcony which overlooked the tree-filled backyard from one floor up. The home is a split level. The living area on the upper level includes kitchen, dining and living rooms and bedroom wing. The ground level is a recreation area.

The problem with the small balcony off the dining room, besides its small size, was that it didn't go anywhere—no steps down to the backyard, no way to get to it except through the dining room.

Vermeulen and his clients immediately saw the potential. Together they drew up plans for a two level deck as large as the indoor living and dining area combined. They hired a carpenter who could see immediately what they had in mind and the results were beyond all expectations.

The homeowner now smilingly refers to the natural wood finish, two-level deck as "our summer resort" and his wife adds "or our tree house."

A stand of tall oaks and hickory trees create the tree house atmosphere. The deck's upper level seems to be suspended among them. The trees provide both beauty and privacy for

the setting. The three wide steps between the deck's levels offer added

seating area when the homeowners invite a crowd for an informal cook-out. Built-in seats around the edges of the deck add extra space for guests. The deck is situated so that the lower level is sunny in the morning and the upper level gets the sun in the late afternoon.

Deck chairs with a chocolate brown fabric, Indian batik prints and two huge hand-woven grain baskets from India carry the feeling of the interior out of doors.

TO DIMINISH THE IMPACT of the high ceilings in the living-dining area and to downplay the non-removable rough hewn ceiling beams, the walls, ceiling and beams were painted a soft plum brown. The wall which extends through both rooms is papered in an Indian leather strapwork pattern, black, off-white and mauve that borders on brown. The carpeting, taupe brown, is very close to the shade of the plain walls and ceiling. An off-white sectional in the living room is complemented by a large, square striped pine coffee table in country English style. A rattan sofa, really a companion piece to the sectional, is covered in a linen Indian batik print in mauve, brown and off-white.

It is in the many pieces of original art—wall hangings, ceramics, paintings and sculpture—that the color accents come through.

A dozen handwoven pillows, each different, and a hand loomed throw add textural contrasts to the sectional. A large coral to deep pink abstract painting over the sectional takes on a vital, vibrant quality under the discreetly placed track lights.

Table and floor lamps are all on dimmers so the mood of the home can be changed quickly from bright and cheery to seductively soft.

Open weave linen drapes in the living and dining rooms assure nighttime privacy without obliterating the outdoor beauty of the trees.

try floral print, has shades of yellow, brown, amber and bittersweet, a delightful complement to the warm cypress.

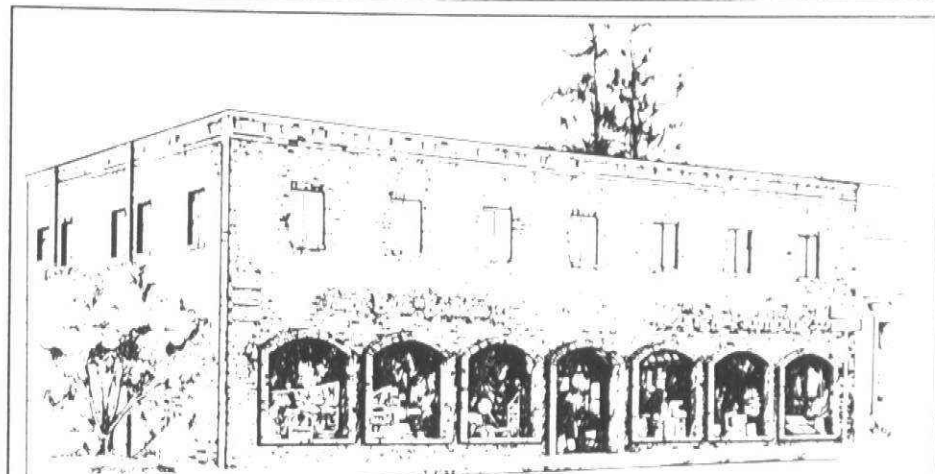
The variations in the tones of the brick floor seem to pick up and liven these warm earth colors.

Yellow lets the sunshine in

From the palest lemon yellow walls to the sparkling crystal vase bearing tall slender stalks of lemon yellow glads that dominate the glass topped table, the room speaks of light and airiness—a breath of fresh sunshine.

And that's just what the room's decorator had in mind.

"The living room was dark and gloomy and the Hales wanted something lighter," said Brian Collins. He designed the room for the Kenneth Hale family of the Nottingham Woods subdivision in Livonia.

"The dark gold wool velvet carpeting was in good condition, so the Hales wanted to keep it and work around it," said Collins, who works out of Hudson's Westland.

To lighten the room, Collins worked in shades of yellow, off-white and a few touches of burgundy as an accent color.

"I tied in the dark gold carpet with a double band of the same gold color and

yellow on the drapery tie-backs and the shaped cornice boards," he said. "That's the only place that color appears."

The room began to take shape by having walls and ceiling painted a very pale yellow.

"Some people think it's strange to have the walls and ceiling the same color, but I think it wraps up the room in a nice package," said Collins.

The interior itself could be called eclectic, said Collins. The furnishings represent several styles—English, Oriental and contemporary.

"We wanted a mixture for interest," said Collins. "The Hales didn't have any strong preference for a particular style."

The furniture, most of which is new, came from Hudson's. The exception is the large dark wood structure that houses a stereo system and color television.

In front of this unit sits a wool velvet chair and ottoman in stripes of yellow, cream and very light gold.

"This chair needed to be durable

because it gets a lot of wear in front of the TV," said Collins.

He pointed out the repeated use of "brass and glass" to give light and sparkle to the room.

An antique gold framed glass topped table sits in front of the yellow silk sofa, and a similar taller table line another wall.

Various sized and shaped crystal adorn the dark wood end tables and Oriental dark wood chest. The crystal sends rays of sparkling color reverberating through the room.

The burgundy accent color is seen in two striped silk pillows on the couch and in two candles of the several on the glass table. Other crystal and brass candlesticks hold off-white and yellow candles.

A cream-colored silk damask love seat piled high with fluffy pillows, and a matching wing chair are the remaining major pieces in the room. A dark wood chair with a yellow brocade seat is in the corner.

An interesting picture arrangement hangs on the wall above the sofa.

"The symmetrical aspect of a room can get boring if carried too far," said Collins. "We had the sofa, two end tables, two lamps, etc. So we broke the shape with the conglomeration of pictures."

The antique botanical prints were custom framed for the Hales and matted in foil and silk to pick up the sparkle of the brass and glass, Collins said.

Several antique bird prints, similarly framed and matted, are on another wall.

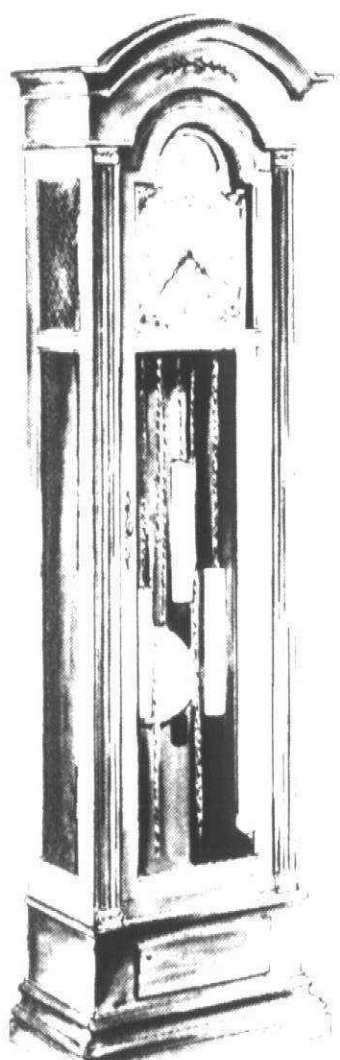
Other accessories include a yellow porcelain Oriental lamp, two brass and porcelain lamps and a crystal one.

"The Hales wanted a formal living room, but a comfortable one—one they could use," said Collins. "Their five children are taught to respect the room, but it isn't off limits."

"They find it works very well for them."

The Hales liked the results so well, they have Collins transforming their dark dining room into similar light and airy yellow.

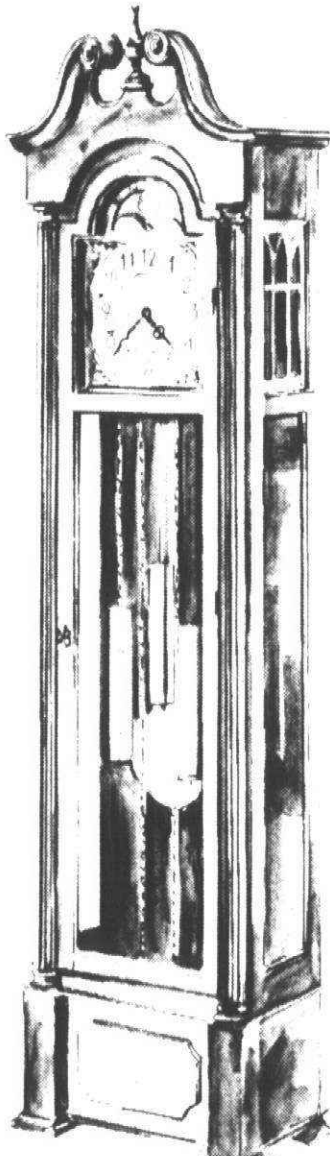

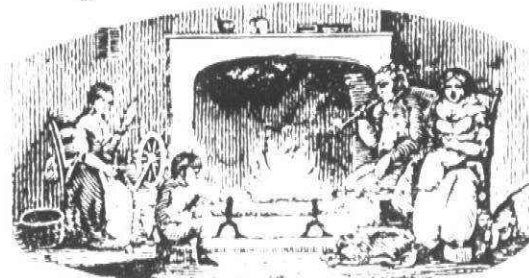

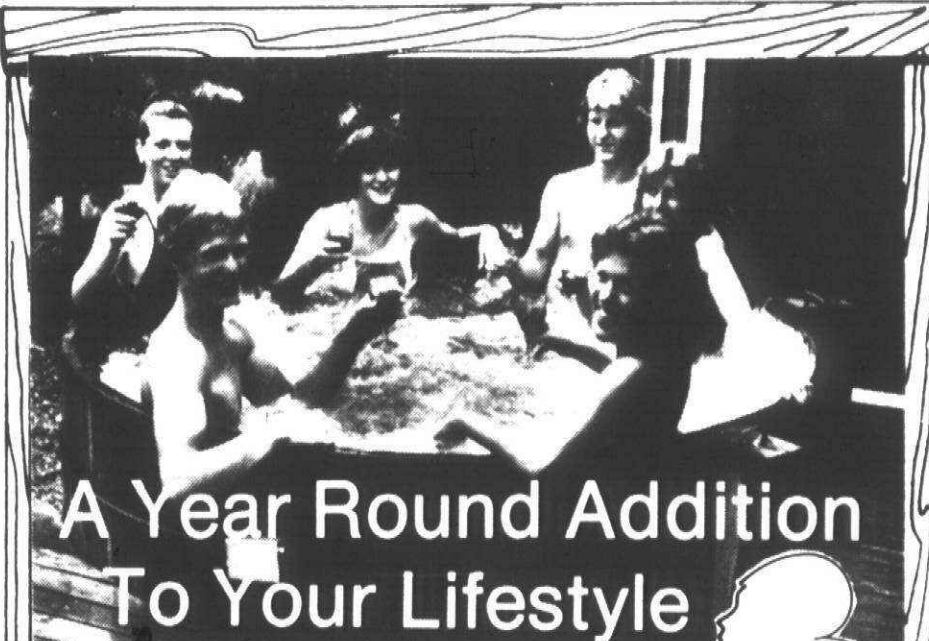

Choose fixtures for wear

Home decorators are enthusiastic about plush-looking bathrooms. For many families, an extra bathroom would be luxury enough.

The National Kitchen Cabinet Association says families that need an additional bathroom are often stymied by the thought of where to put it. Some suggestions: a walk-in closet, a pantry, a back porch, a mud room or a utility room. Try to find space off the kitchen or under the main bathroom; it's easier to run plumbing lines.

Even if the extra bathroom is small, without tub or shower facilities, it needn't lack storage space. Undercounter vanities, wall-mounted cabinets and corner units provide space for towels, soap, tissues, and the overflow of health and beauty paraphernalia from the other bath. Cabinets are available in a variety of wood-grain finishes, and in white and gold.

Also important is the ability of bathroom equipment to take the daily abuse it's bound to get. Bath vanities, for example, are subjected to heat and humidity, soap and water splashes and cosmetic and medicine spills. Children sometimes use vanity shelves as step stools to reach sink faucets, or climb and sit on countertops.

To help insure vanities can withstand mistreatment as well as daily wear, look for the NKCA emblem inside cabinet doors or drawers. The seal indicates that bathroom cabinets meet the construction and performance standards of the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and have passed laboratory tests.

Dining room's gone, everybody's happy

"We needed a room where we could talk," said Scott Shuptrine Co. interior designer Sandy Robinson.

Try to come up with even a reasonable facsimile in a standard subdivision home. Most people resign themselves to conventional mediocrity. Not this lady. She refused to compromise family priorities (travel and other luxuries) for a larger, high-cost home.

So she devised a scheme to eliminate the nine-foot by 11-foot dining room ("It was too small to serve any real purpose, anyway," she said) and replaced it with a library-guest room.

The last remaining vestige of what had been the little-used dining room is a handsome brass-milk glass chandelier that fits in with the oak decor.

"At last my husband has his own retreat," Mrs. Robinson said.

Once the opening from kitchen to dining room was sealed, it became his. There is no TV, no radio, just books, memorabilia and a wide, shuttered window overlooking the 12-variety rose garden.

Large double oak doors close off the din of daily living. Open, they allow a flow into the adjacent living area to help make it look even larger. The good feeling of freedom here in this relatively small area comes from unified carpeting and beamed cathedral ceilings.

Wide, floor-to-ceiling solid oak shelves comprise one wall. Those remaining are covered in textured grass cloth. Furnishings are simple in design and substantial. Oatmeal and gold hues blend subtly. Accessories are basics like a Tiffany lamp, varieties of mugs, brass objets d'art, wall prints and throw pillows.

Each furniture piece plays a dual role. The sofa is also a bed. An end table is a chess table, with king's men and pawns readied for play. A lounge chair can be pushed around the corner to augment seating arrangements in the living room.

Get acquainted with windows

Whether a face is lovely to look at or a house delightful to see depends on how well the features fit together.

Most of us have to accept less than perfect faces. But, by combining the right entry, windows, siding and roof, anyone can have a home passersby will pause to admire.

Of all house features, few are more essential to over-all appearance than windows, which often comprise a major portion of the outer walls.

Fortunately, wood sash windows come in a wide style range and are easily matched to exterior decor. Popular styles include:

- Double-hungs, which operate vertically. Found in most homes, they're adaptable to any architecture.

- Casements, which are hinged at one side, open like a door. They give good visibility and ventilation, are easy to reach and operate, especially above sinks and countertops, and have a contemporary look.

- Both bows, which are convex, and bays, straight in the middle and angled at each end, have a gracious look and generous glass areas.

Used with removable

multipane grilles, they are "de rigueur" for Early American homes.

- Sliders, which operate horizontally, create a dramatic glass wall effect when used in series. Sliding glass doors combine wide visibility with handy access to patios and decks.

- Awnings, which open out and up, and hoppers, in and down, offer unlimited views, adjustable ventilation, and contemporary design when stacked or installed in series.

Used with fixed-sash, they provide air flow for picture windows.

Wood windows add substance to style with preservative-treated sash, factory-applied weatherstripping and optional double-pane insulating glass or storm panels.

Their energy-efficiency reduces heat loss and reduces condensation. Wood sash can be stained to enhance the natural grain or painted to blend with decorating schemes.

Ready-made wood windows are available in stock sizes at local window distributors, lumber dealers and building supply centers and can be installed by do-it-yourselfers.

The massive oak desk doubles as a home-office unit for audiologist Dr. Dale Robinson. Here he studies, researches and writes before publishing his reports. And, when needed, the room is for guests.

Mrs. Robinson, who planned and designed the project, earned her bachelor's degree at Michigan State University after a two-year stint at University of Iowa.

"It took me 11 years in between children to get it," she said.

She has ambitious plans for kitchen remodeling—but not before another conversion job on the family room ("also too small for practical purposes") into a more formal dining area.
