'30s dishes in demand

Depression glass, that shiny dinnerware that once brightened hard times and now brings a gleam to the eyes of thousands of collectors, gets its big showing this year at Schoolcraft College.

The Michigan Depression Glass Society has chosen the Waterman Center building on the campus on Haggerty between Six and Seven Mile for its sixth annual show. There will be collectors and dealers from all over the state at the Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 14-15, show.

Held for five years in Ypsilanti, Pat Mitchell, president of the collectors group in this state, said the show was moved to Schoolcraft because of the spacious facilities and ability to serve refreshments as well as the easy accessibility of the site from all major highways.

Depression glass and Depression era glass is typified by the dishes that used to be given away by movie theaters in Depression days when people couldn't afford to buy new dishes.

Now these pieces bring prices comparable to what a set of dinnerware might have cost then. They are collected by more than 100,000, and many of these collectors will arrive prepared to add to their sets.

FEATURED in this show will be Fostoria glass, made by a company that began business in 1887, switched to the rainbow pastel shades during the 1920s and continues in business today.

"Fostoria was chosen because it so well represents the glass of the Depression times," said Mrs. Mitchell.

Judith Olett, a national table top consultant for the Ohio firm, will be a special guest at the Schoolcraft show, giving hourly seminars with movies, slides, pattern identification, history and literature.

"If you have broken a piece of Fostoria stemware which was a wedding gift in 1930, or wish to add to a set of dinnerware you never quite finished, chances are good you will find it at this show," Mrs. Mitchell said.

Besides the Fostoria displays, there will be 24 exhibitors representing 10 states. Their wares will include hundreds of patterns and thousands of different pieces. Nora Koch, editor of the

Negotiations begin again

Teachers win arbitration

Negotiations may begin soon on starting and ending times of school, and lunch periods, as a result of an arbitration ruling issued last week.

The teachers union won an arbitration dispute filed against the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education for changing school schedules without bargaining.

As a result, both sides may meet at the table within two weeks. The date for the first meeting might be set at an informal session between both parties Wednesday.

The order that bargaining must be held on scheduling was made by arbitrator Nathan Lyson, a professor of law at the University of Detroit.

Lyson's arbitration award provides that if agreement is not reached at the table by Oct. 23, the school board must, if the union insists, restore last year's schedule "but not to the extent that district operations are unduly disturbed, or severe hardship to the district results."

That last qualifier leaves Norman Kee, chief bargainer for the school board, puzzled as to what might happen if agreement is not reached at the table.

"I hope a settlement on this can be reached at the table, and we'll certainly begin negotiations hoping to

reach an agreement. But there's no question that an implementation of last year's school schedule would cause a severe hardship to the district, and would greatly disrupt the community at large.

"The arbitrator seemed to have recognized that in his decision."

John Ryder, president of the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA), said, "I think the real significance of the ruling is that teachers' hours and working conditions are considered negotiable items. That was our contention all along."

"On May 17, our executive council notified the school administration that we considered the proposed changes in schedules to be negotiable. The crux of the problem is that the board refused to negotiate."

"If they had agreed, all the time and money spent on arbitration could have been avoided."

WHEN A REQUEST for additional operating taxes was defeated by voters, the administration decided to stagger starting and ending times of the school day. In addition, lunch hours were shortened.

The changes were made to handle the increased number of students with minimal additions of buses, drivers and teachers. Not making the changes would have cost \$225,000, the adminis-

tration estimated. That money would have been used to buy five buses, hire six additional teachers and additional bus drivers.

Last August, the new schedules were distributed showing starting times 20 to 30 minutes later and closing times 10 to 35 minutes later. Lunch hours were cut from 55 to 40 minutes. And for one day each week at the elementary schools, students were scheduled to arrive 45 minutes later than the normal starting times.

During the arbitration hearing, Harvey Wax (attorney for the teachers union) argued that some of the \$225,000 added expense could be paid by the state. Wax also said the new schedule resulted in a savings of at least \$82,000, and that sum should be deducted from the cost of restoring the old system.

According to Wax, then, the net cost of restoring last year's schedule would be less than \$140,000.

Police charge men with area break-ins

Canton police have charged two Westland men with the Sept. 26 break-in of a home in which \$2,000 worth of goods were stolen.

William Kirby, 27, of 32441 Muskegon, and Michael Jodway, 18, of 2140 Alberta, stood mute at their arraignment in 35th District Court last week. Judge Dunbar Davis set the bond at \$5,000 and scheduled an examination date for Oct. 12.

The breaking and entering charge is a felony that carries a 15-year jail sentence.

Kirby has also been charged by Westland police for concealing stolen property. He is being held in Westland in lieu of the \$1,000 bond set at his arraignment in 18th District Court last Wednesday. Kirby stood mute on the charge and is scheduled for exam-

ination in the Westland court on Oct. 10.

According to Sgt. Dennis Joker of the Canton Police Department, most of the goods stolen Sept. 26 from the Canton home at 50214 Cherry Hill have been recovered. The owner of the dwelling, Leslie Freedle, was not at home at the time of the break-in.

The goods from Ms. Freedle's home were discovered by Canton and Westland police in the Westland homes of two of Kirby's acquaintances, police said. Westland police have arrested Kirby on the misdemeanor charge of concealing stolen property worth less than \$100. But, according to the city's police, efforts are under way to change the arrest warrant to felonious concealment of stolen property—a crime that carries a four-year jail sentence.

Regional 'copter patrol plan culls mixed reactions

Reaction to a proposal of Canton Supervisor Harold Stein to establish an area-wide police helicopter program ranges from enthusiastic to cool among municipal officials contacted by the Observer.

Stein proposed establishment of the program at last week's township board meeting to beef up police patrols in several western Wayne County communities.

The proposal includes the cities of Plymouth, Northville and Belleville and the townships of Plymouth, Northville, Sumpter, Van Buren and Huron.

Although details of the proposal are not clear, Stein suggests that Canton and other western Wayne County communities submit a joint application for an innovative project grant to the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA).

If approved, the grant would be used to finance the operation of area-wide police helicopter surveillance.

STEIN PRESENTED the proposal as several township board members successfully lobbied for a reversal of an earlier board decision to purchase three surplus military helicopters at \$500 each for the Canton Police Department.

The debate was sparked by information brought forward by trustee Lynne Goldsmith and treasurer candidate Maria Falkiewicz.

Both women submitted information that contradicted Stein's earlier statements. They showed that municipalities must use surplus military helicopters within one year after they are purchased—not five years as previously stated by Stein.

Both women said the federal government would repossess the choppers if they are not used within one year. Stein had told the township board three weeks earlier that Canton could resell the choppers at a profit if they were not used within five years.

In a last-ditch effort to save the helicopter program, Stein contacted officials of several surrounding communities early last week to lay out his proposal of area-wide chopper surveillance.

He reported to the board last Tuesday that the communities "showed interest and will support my ideas and concept of this program."

The supervisor unsuccessfully asked the board to go ahead with the helicopter purchase. The board indicated, however, that it may reconsider its decision if other communities show a definite interest in Stein's plan.

FOUR OF THE FIVE municipal officials contacted by the Observer last week, however, had lukewarm reactions to Stein's proposal.

Plymouth City Manager Fred Yockey, Plymouth Township Supervisor Tom Notebaert, Northville City Manager Steven Walters and Van Buren Township Supervisor Patricia Cullin said the governing bodies of their municipalities would be willing to listen to the proposal.

But that's as far as their support went.

"He (Stein) asked me if we would favor the program if it could be proved beneficial and the cost would not be prohibitive," said Yockey. "That's like saying, 'Are you in favor of motherhood?'"

"Frankly, we've got along fine without helicopters in the past."

Although Plymouth Township does not have a police department, Notebaert believes helicopter surveillance could aid Wayne County Sheriff patrols of his township. Funding for the sheriff department's helicopter program is expected to end Dec. 1.

"I can see where the program might be beneficial," Notebaert said, "but then, there's a lot of things you'd like to have, but sometimes you can't afford them."

The most enthusiastic reaction to Stein's proposal came from Wilson Grier, supervisor of Northville Township.

"I think the concept is good," said Grier, a former naval aviator with the U.S. Marine Corps. "There is a great need for the type of program Mr. Stein is talking about."

"The question it will come down to is strictly financial. That is the only reason I would vote no."

CANTON TRUSTEE Goldsmith maintains that a police helicopter program is "horrendously expensive." She points to the City of Warren's \$300,000 allocation to support its helicopter program this year.

The trustee also said grants for helicopter programs are a low priority on LEAA's grant eligibility list.

Stein says otherwise. He maintains the choppers he has proposed to purchase are the most inexpensive helicopters to fly. He proposes to fly them only four hours a day.

Stein also insists that Canton has a good chance of winning an innovative project grant from the LEAA to support operation of the program.

Family frets about fire screen

The Deck and Den store in Canton has a slogan, "Everything you little 'hearth' desires," which owner James Guiles said he lives up to.

But for one Canton family, a hearth has caused considerable unhappiness.

George and Dory Packard have lived in Canton less than a year and have been busy fixing up their new home. One of the things they wanted to do was to get a glass door for their fireplace.

They ordered a custom-made door from the Portland Willamette Co. through the Deck and Den store last March and made a \$100 deposit.

The screen duly arrived, and a store employee attempted to install it July 26.

versions of the problem diverge at this point.

Mrs. Packard said the person who was installing the screen couldn't get it on properly, pulled insulation off the fireplace screen, and never came back to finish the job properly. She had paid the installer the \$222 due on the screen.

Guiles said the screen is installed as well as possible, and nothing is wrong that couldn't be fixed with patching cement. The culprit in the story seems to be neither the Packards or Guiles. The door didn't fit properly because the fireplace is crooked. One side of the fireplace juts out a little more than the other side, causing a gap between the fireplace and one part of the screen.

Guiles said he told the Packards about the potential problem with fit-

ting the screen when they ordered it.

The Packards said they did not know there would be problems installing the screen and believe a custom-made screen should have been designed to compensate for the difference.

"All we want is for the screen to fit right," Mrs. Packard said.

"Mr. Guiles said it was 'going to fit beautifully' when we ordered it. He offered to refund the cost of installation, \$30, but we can't fix it, and we don't know anyone else who can."

Mrs. Packard said she went to lawyer Walter Hink III of Canton to attempt to get her fireplace door fixed. She has copies of two letters Hink wrote, one to Guiles and one to the Willamette Co., asking for satisfaction. Hink's services cost her \$65.

Guiles responded to Hink's letter saying that he had offered to refund

the installation fee. "At this time," his reply states, "both Mr. and Mrs. Packard became very boisterous and stood in front of our store and shouted at potential customers telling them not to shop here."

A representative for the Willamette company said no letter ever came from Hink. The representative told Mrs. Packard that she would be reimbursed if there is a problem with the screen.

Although Guiles said he believes his store is not at fault, and all efforts were made to put the door in as well as possible, he told the Observer he will send someone out to look at the fireplace door again some time this week.

Mrs. Packard said she has taken the matter to small claims court.

Fourth Friday count is up

The enrollment prophets silently beamed with pride when the official Fourth Friday Count was taken in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

In September 1977 the student enrollment predictors, directed by Supt. John M. Hoben, projected a student population of 16,100 for September 1978.

When the official count was taken the fourth Friday in September, it totaled some 16,152 students. Being off by 52 students isn't too bad, but the accuracy may improve when an audit of the enrollment is completed.

"It was still difficult to get a real accurate count on our night school program and pre-schoolers," Hoben said.

"The official count shows 290 for night school, and a pre-school fulltime equivalent of 14. We might lose some of these during the audit, so the actual count might end up at about 16,125."

If so, the predictions of a year ago will be within 25 students—or within one-tenth of one per cent.

THE NET RESULT is an increase of about 900 students from last year, in line with the district's long-term projections.

The official count is taken on the fourth Friday of September each year for the purpose of computing state aid, which is distributed on a per pupil basis with allowances made for local property tax wealth.

When the school board established the operating millage rate for 1978-79, it based the levy on an enrollment in September of 16,000. The administration had recommended a slightly higher levy based on a projected 16,100 enrollment.

The school board chose the more conservative figure because of a complicated rollback provision of the state aid formula which financially penalizes districts which pad enrollment projections.

"Because our official enrollment will be about 125 higher than the school board's estimate for purposes

of setting the tax rate, we will be receiving about \$40,000 more in state aid," Hoben said.

"Of course, we'll have to spend more money to educate those 125 students."

The 1978-79 budget projects total expenditures of slightly more than \$21.6 million. Hoben said the budget was balanced only because the expenditure side includes some \$1.1 million in fund equity from previous years.

"So, actually, the approximate \$40,000 in additional state aid will have the effect of reducing the amount of fund equity we have to use," he said.

The current enrollment crunch is in the middle schools and at the high schools. The three new elementaries constructed a couple years ago, and the implementation of year-round school, are absorbing the student growth at the elementary level.

Treat protection

Canton's police department will use a metal detector Halloween night (Oct. 31) from 6 p.m. until 10 p.m. to make sure kids' candy is safe. Kids can take their candy to the Canton fire department building, Canton Center and Cherry Hill roads, to have it scanned for the presence of metal. This is the second year the service has been offered. Luckily, police found no dangerous objects in candy last year.

service increases, the dollars decrease."

She also is unhappy about the fact that Detroit, for instance, receives more funds than this area.

be less than \$140,000.

The union also argued the district wouldn't have to buy five additional buses because it now has 14 buses that aren't used on regular runs.

During the hearing, Kee testified that the district had changed the elementary starting times four times from September 1973 to September 1974 without any protest from the union, and had changed starting times in middle schools and high schools several times from 1969 to 1978 without a union protest.

ONE MAJOR AREA of dispute centers on discussions between Kee and Bill Bartlett, past president of the union.

Bartlett was informed informally of the proposed schedule changes and had been shown four alternative schedules being considered by administration. On June 28 Bartlett had confirmed that the fourth alternative was

preferable to him and he'd try to sell it to teachers, Kee said.

Bartlett insisted, however, that he was only speaking for himself and not for the union. The arbitrator ruled that these discussions did constitute collective bargaining.

On May 17 of this year, the executive council of the PCEA said the union would not accept any change in the school day unless it was negotiated. Until it was, all teachers should be notified to report to school as in previous school years, the union said.

The union was relying on language in the contract which states, in part: "The board agrees . . . to negotiate any changes in personnel policies related to hours, wages and working conditions of teachers."

Arbitrator Lypson, in ruling for the union, said the district didn't deliberately violate contract proceedings and had proceeded in good faith.

"The duty to negotiate does not

allow bargaining to take place only after a disputed change has been made," he noted. "The board followed a unilateral course, and adhered to the chosen direction even after notification by the PCEA that negotiations were required."

IN RULING ON behalf of the union, Lypson said:

"Unfortunately, the kind of situation now facing the arbitrator is becoming increasingly common in school districts: On the one hand inflation and employee demands are driving costs upward, while on the other hand citizens are not only refusing to pay higher taxes, but are instead demanding tax cuts.

"In such circumstances, the desire of the Plymouth-Canton administration to effect economies in the 1978-79 bus schedule is quite understandable.

"But . . . it must be understood that

the arbitrator derives his power from the contract of the parties and has an obligation to resolve disputes by reasonable interpreting and then applying the language that the parties have bargained.

"It has long been my position that where the contract speaks, it is not the opinion of the arbitrator that counts but the obligations spelled out in the contract.

"There can be no question that reporting times, duration of lunch hours, quitting times and planning periods" all are covered by contract language requiring bargaining before any change is made.

"It is quite clear from the evidence that the board did not meet its contractual bargaining obligations in effecting the contested schedule, and that in such circumstances, the good faith or good reasons of the employer become irrelevant."

Salem netters tie but should win Sub-8 crown

Plymouth Salem's girls' tennis team all but wrapped up another Suburban Eight League crown after finishing in a tie with Trenton at the league meet in Dearborn Thursday.

In the Sub-8, league titles are determined by dual match results and the loop meet. Although the Rocks tied Trenton, they beat the Trojans in dual competition and sport a perfect 4-0 record to Trenton's 3-1 mark.

Both squads finish dual match play today and tomorrow with make-out contests of previously rain-out

matches. Salem only has to beat Dearborn Edsel Ford today at the Centennial Park to win the outright title. Trenton should win its last match with Bentley tomorrow but it wouldn't matter if the Rocks beat Edsel Ford.

It is almost a forgone conclusion that the strong Salem netters will handily defeat the Thunderbirds for the league title. Edsel Ford not only finished last in the Sub-8 meet, but were losing five of the seven matches to the Rocks when the rains came and postponed play. The scores of these

matches are resumed today.

In fact, it's so obvious that Salem will close out with a triumph that, according to Rock coach Jan Lawson, the Thunderbirds considered forfeiting the match rather than play the inevitable. Lawson, however, said she wants to complete the match.

SALEM RELIED on the play of its singles players, as Kathy Horton, Betsy Moon and Rene Braun, all took home league medals for their respective first-place finishes.

It marked the second straight season Horton and Moon have won league championships. Last season, Horton, the only unbeaten Salem netter, won the league title at third singles. This season, she took the second-singles crown in her junior year. Moon, just a sophomore, won at fourth singles last season and rebounded with a third singles victory this year.

Braun, only a sophomore, won the fourth singles title, which included a big second-round victory over Trenton's Missy Chapman.

The Rocks actually took 11 of their 14 points thanks to the singles players. Trenton and Dearborn, who finished third with seven points, dominated the doubles play.

The only major disappointment this day was co-captain Becky Crespo's failure to win the first-singles title. She lost in the finals in a real heartbreaker to Trenton's Lynee Scndel, 7-5, 7-6, 2-6.

Crespo, the mainstay and leader of the Rocks and also a four-year starter, won the league title last year at first singles but the horrid weather proved

to be her downfall.

Crespo beat her Trenton opponent during the regular season but was forced to split sets this time around. With the score, 1-1, in the third and deciding set, the rain began to fall, making it more difficult to play. Winds gusting up to 50 miles an hour had already plagued all the netters.

So the match was immediately moved to the Dearborn Racquet Club where Crespo subsequently lost. Crespo has never been an outstanding

Mandle runs wild

Canton blanks Mott, 18-0

The final score: Russ Mandle 18, Waterford Mott 0.

Yes, that man with the red bandana on his head ran wild Friday night giving Plymouth Canton its first homecoming football victory in the six-year history of the school.

Mandle ran through, around and in-between the stunned Corsairs, as he gained 242 yards rushing on 28 carries. He also made two outstanding defensive plays from his linebacker position that helped the Chiefs preserve their third shutout of the season.

It also marked the fourth straight game which Mott, currently 1-4 over-

all, has been shut out. The Corsairs have gone 17 quarters without scoring. "Three wins and three shutouts," said Canton coach Dave Schuele, who watched his 3-2 squad win its first Western Six League game in three years. "You win games with 'D' (defense). We're very happy. The kids played well, and that's the first home-

coming win for us."

And as for Mandle.

"That kid is a helluva ball carrier and a helluva player. You just can't bring him down. If no college comes down and takes this kid, they're crazy. He's just fabulous.

"I thought we controlled the game. Mandle was fantastic and (Bob Hamblin is coming into his own."

It was evident from the start that the large homecoming crowd was not only going to see the "Russ Mandle Show," but they were also going to witness a Waterford Mott squad, which was big enough to scare anyone but slow enough catch no one.

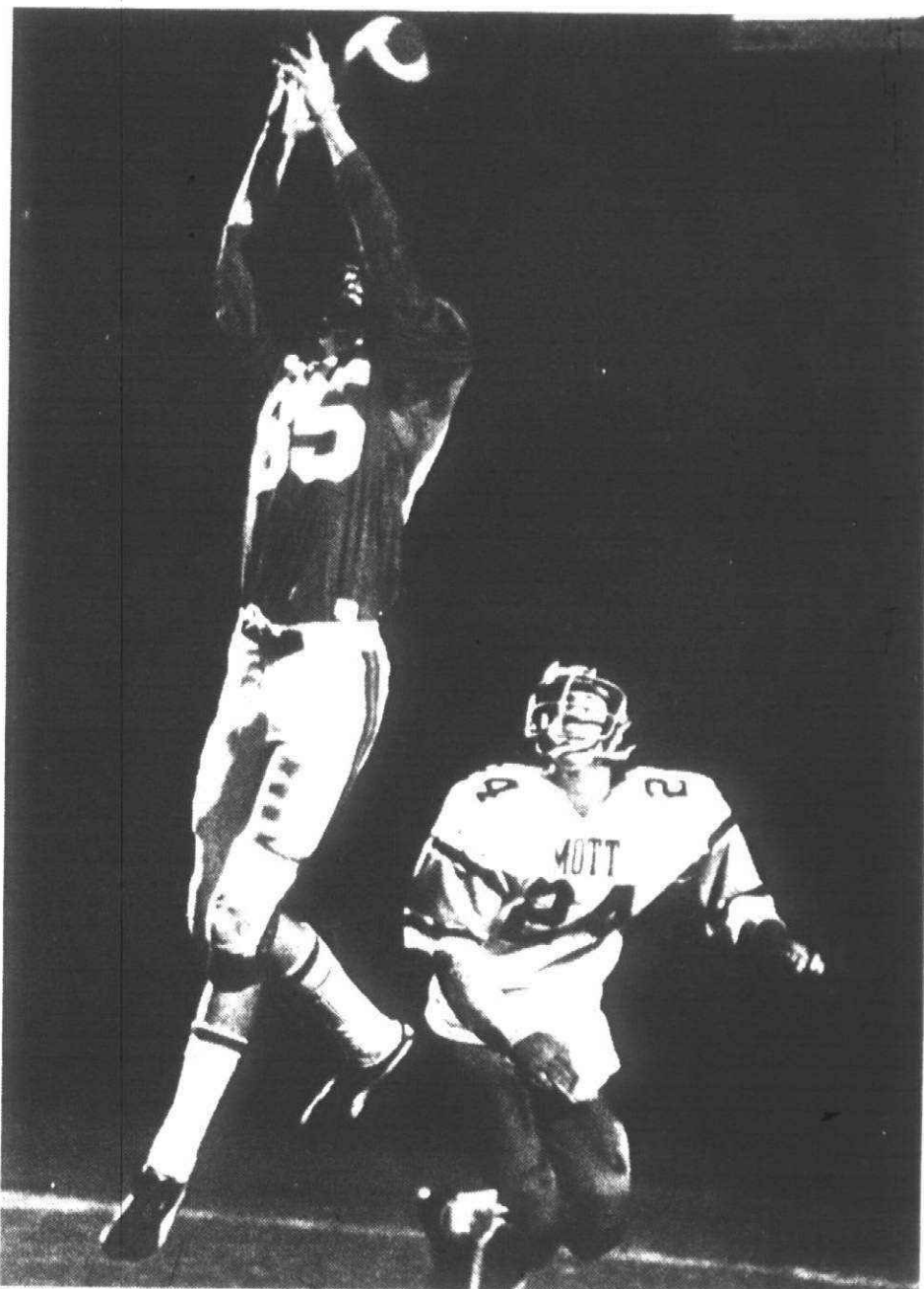
THE CHIEFS took the opening kick off 74-yards in seven plays for the first score. Mandle carried on five of these plays totalling 65 of the yards, including a 43-yard touchdown romp at the 8:31 mark of the first quarter.

Canton kept the 6-0 lead after the first of three extra-point plays failed.

Although the score remained 6-0 at halftime, the Chiefs dominated the action with their ground control offense. Mandle continued to mount the yardage, while sidekick Hamblin chipped in with a few tough carries from his fullback position.

Canton had two good opportunities to score at the end of the second quarter. On one drive, the Chiefs travelled from their own eight-yard line to inside the Mott 10-yard line before quarterback Scott Dawson fumbled to end the threat. Mott was stopped on three straight plays following the long Canton drive and was forced to punt.

Canton's Jay McKinley grabbed the short 27-yard punt on the Mott 40-yard line and returned it 18 yards to the 22. Canton failed to score, however, as Dawson's pass to tight end Mike Pathe went through his hands in the end zone just as the half ended.

Defensive halfback Steve Gray set up Canton's second touchdown with a pass interception late in the third quarter. Mott was forced to pass after two clipping penalties, and Gray took advantage, advancing the ball to the Corsairs' 34-yard line.

Five plays later and one minute into the fourth quarter, Mandle scored on a 19-yard dive play to all but wrap up Canton's third victory in five games.

Another pass interception, this time by Jay McKinley, ended Mott's only real scoring threat midway in the

fourth period.

Canton scored its final touchdown with 15 seconds left in the game when the second unit, led by quarterback Greg Mallare, reached paydirt. Mallare sneaked over from the one-yard line for the touchdown.

Just two plays earlier, the Chiefs, with the game well in hand, called a fake punt play. Punter Steve Eddy threw a strike to Mandle, who scored easily past the unsuspecting Corsairs, but the touchdown was called back because of a penalty.

Rocks nip RU; set eyes on Trenton showdown

The stage has been set for what should prove to be one of the biggest showdowns ever in Suburban Eight League history.

Plymouth Salem's powerful wish-bone offense was held scoreless for three quarters before scoring two touchdowns in the final period to edge Redford Union, 13-6, Friday at the Panther field.

Couple this Rock victory with Trenton's 18-0 win over Dearborn Edsel Ford that same night, and one has a battle of the unbeaten when Salem faces Trenton Friday night in Plymouth for what may decide the league championship.

The Rocks and the Trojans are currently 5-0 overall and 4-0 in Sub-8 play. They are the only two undefeated teams in the league.

Redford Union, on the other hand, fell to 1-4 overall and 1-3 in league play. But one can't fault the hard-luck Panthers for their less-than-impressive record. Redford Union has lost its last three games all by just one touchdown to the three toughest Sub-8 teams—Salem, Trenton and Edsel Ford.

In first half action, opening minutes found Salem as the dominant force as senior co-captain Rich Hewlett led the Rocks to a 25 yard drive in five plays. But Salem forces were haulted from then on as a plague of penalties set in for the Rock offense.

The Panther defense stayed strong throughout the second quarter keeping the Rocks deep in the visitors' territory. Although Redford Union's Curt Marsh intercepted Paul Dillon's half-back option pass, the Panther offense was denied any attempt of scoring as Dillon regained himself by breaking up a Redford Union pass to Paul Babits on the Salem 29-yard line.

Again Salem came on strong at the start of the third period, but the Red-

ford Union defense was equal to the test stopping the Rocks at midfield.

The offense of the Panthers matched the defense for some time as the RU gridders moved from their own 10 yard line to their 45 in a short three plays.

But Salem's defense stymied RU's attack as the game remained scoreless.

Salem finally got on the scoreboard with a drive late in the third quarter. Keyed by rushes from halfbacks Craig Stack and Dillon, the Rocks began to march.

Going to the air, quarterback Hewlett made contact with tight end Mike Prchlik at Redford's ten yard line and was finally brought down at the three by the Panthers' Doug Smith.

Then Hewlett tried to reach paydirt three times on quarterback sneak plays but was stopped at the three-inch line with fourth down and goal-to-go.

Rather than kicking the field goal, Salem coach Tom Moshimer elected to put Hewlett at halfback and let new quarterback Dillon hand the ball off to the all-state griddier. Hewlett powered over the goal line on the fourth-down play and Salem finally got on the scoreboard after three quarters.

Place kicker Rich Hanschu then converted the extra point attempt and the Rocks led, 7-0.

The Panther offense then came back with its touchdown drive. Completing a pass from quarterback Jim Sopha to Paul Babits, Redford Union had moved 37 yards in two plays and were on its way to taking a possible lead in the game.

The Panthers' Bill Lezotte and Bob Utych were the main forces behind the RU drive as they brought the ball down to the Salem eight yard line. Sopha was forced to go to the air after the Rock defense prevented RU from penetrating its front line.

Paul Babits was on the receiving end of Sopha's touchdown pass, and

the Panthers were on the board, 7-6 with a chance to take the lead.

Redford Union coach Harvey Heitman chose to attempt the two point conversion, but Salems' Hewlett and Dillon pushed their way through the

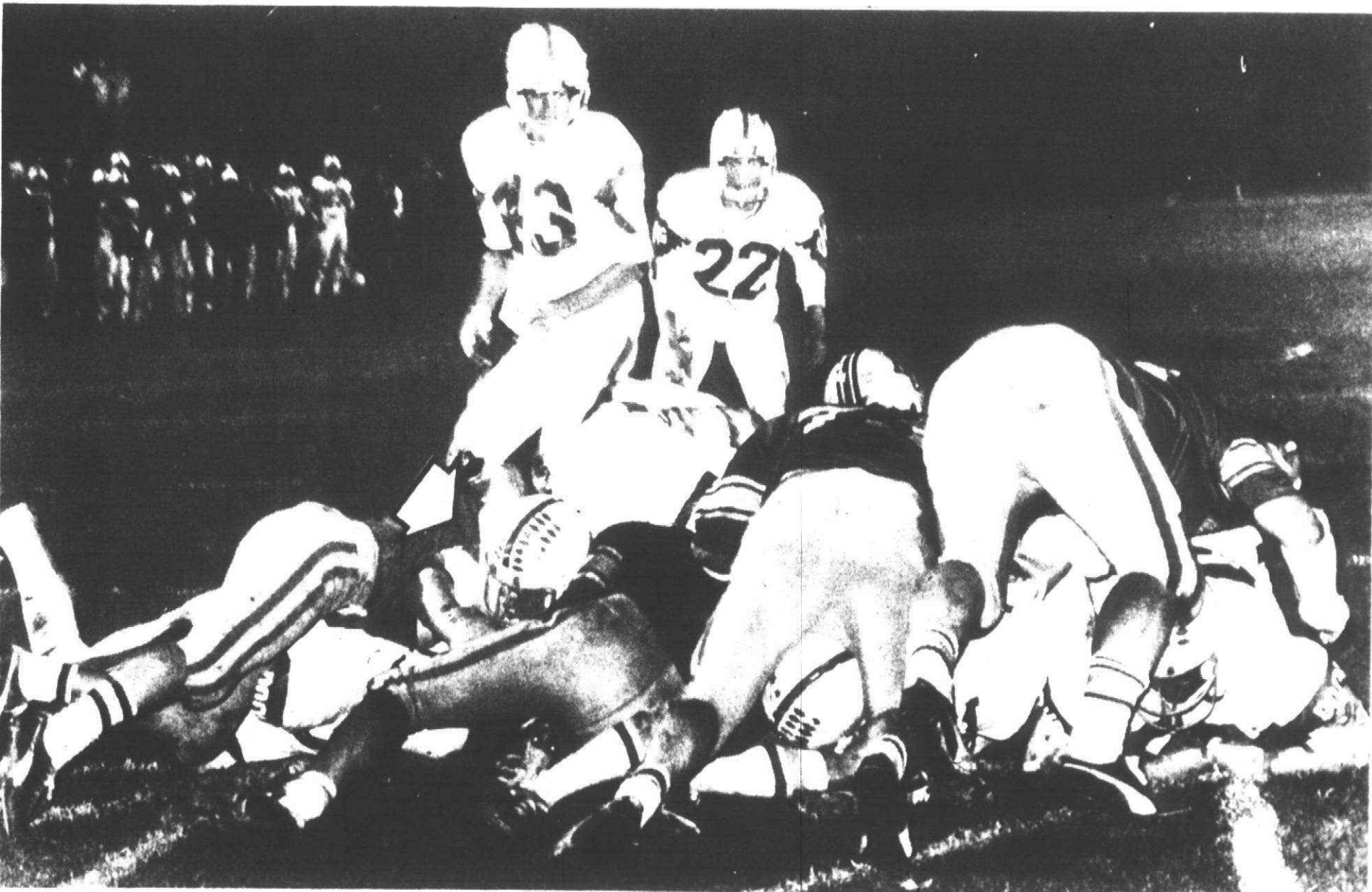
Panther line and rushed Sopha for a loss of 15 yards, and the score remained 7-6.

Obviously discouraged by the missed conversion, Redford Union was forced to gamble on defense and sent 10 men

on the line to stop the Salem rushing attack. Fullback Phil Anderson took advantage of the situation by breaking through the line on Salem's first play from scrimmage after the ensuing kickoff, and raced into the secondary

untouched for an 88-yard touchdown run.

The extra-point attempt was fumbled by holder Dillon, but it didn't matter as Salem had its fifth victory of the season.

But there was an exception to this rule-of-thumb in last Thursday's section (10-5) when I ran a column written by Doug Funke, our Wayne County sports editor. I hope all of you read this piece. It appeared on page 6C in the Plymouth and Canton papers.

I decided to run this column, "To name, or not to name," because I felt it had a message for everyone in the community.

The story was about three Livonia Franklin football players who were kicked off the squad two weeks ago for drinking alcoholic beverages. I actually found out about it and tipped off Doug to the situation.

The column discusses all the flack, hassle and threats Doug received from the Franklin people

because of his intention to print the names of the disciplined players.

It reminded me of a time two years ago when Howard Inch quit the Plymouth Salem basketball team after getting in countless disagreements with head coach Fred Thomann. Inch also had many discipline problems which led to his departure from the team.

Although I was told exactly where to put this piece of news in my story by the Salem coach, I went ahead and wrote an extremely small piece with a headline about the incident—much to the dismay of the Salem coach.

The result—I was banned from the locker room for two games and called every name in the book by the Salem coach.

It's extremely unfortunate that incidents like this occur. It is also unfortunate that I have to report something like this.

But my job, as a reporter and editor, is to gather the news and report the facts, serving as a voice to my readers. If I didn't report the Inch incident, I feel I would have let down my readers.

Think about it. If Rich Hewlett, Salem's Mr.

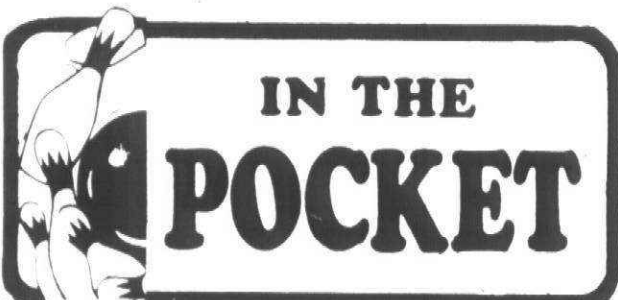

Bentley took the ensuing kickoff and took only 1:28 to tie the score. Joe Race, positioned at split end to the left side, took a pitch from quarterback

Dan Crowder and rambled 20 yards around right end on a flanker-around play for the TD.

Matt Munn ran off right tackle for the two-point conversion to deadlock the score.

The Jaguars capitalized on a pass interception to set-up their second touchdown.

Jim Elledge pilfered a Crowder pass at Allen Park's 49 yard line and Yeske directed the Jaguars all the way down the field in 14 plays.

Angellotti snared a 16-yard toss from Yeske for the TD. The try for two points failed.

Allen Park produced the only points of the second half with 4:15 remaining in the contest.

The Jaguars moved 43 yards in six

plays after a short Bentley punt, and secured the victory when Angellotti squirmed into the endzone on a three-yard run around left end. Again, the two-point attempt failed.

Bentley advanced to Allen Park's 23 yard line as time was running out, but a fumble stalled the last-ditch drive.

Yeske completed only two of 12 passes during the second half, as the Bulldogs' coverage improved considerably.

Greg Pierson gained 80 yards in 14 carries for Bentley and Matt Munn collected 59 yards on 13 rushes.

Carla Hally led the Bulldogs with 12 points and Beth Burgess scored eight. Kim Plachta collected 16 rebounds.

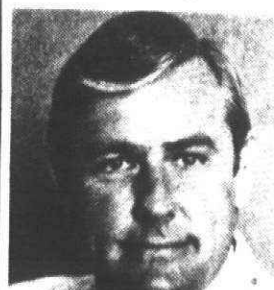
"Debbie Brooks, Dawn Coppersmith and Kellie Kulas came off the bench

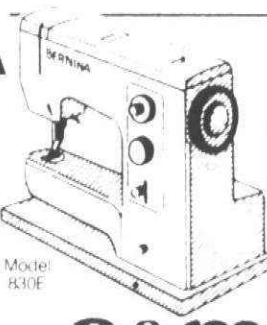

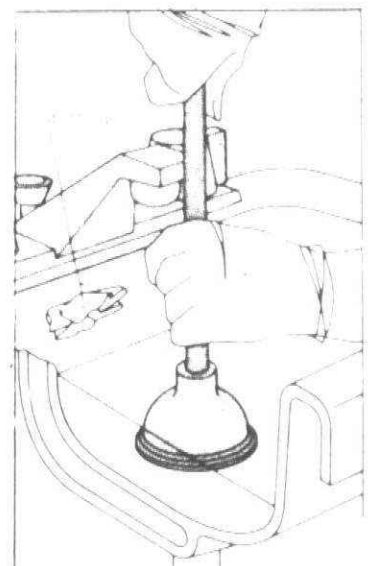

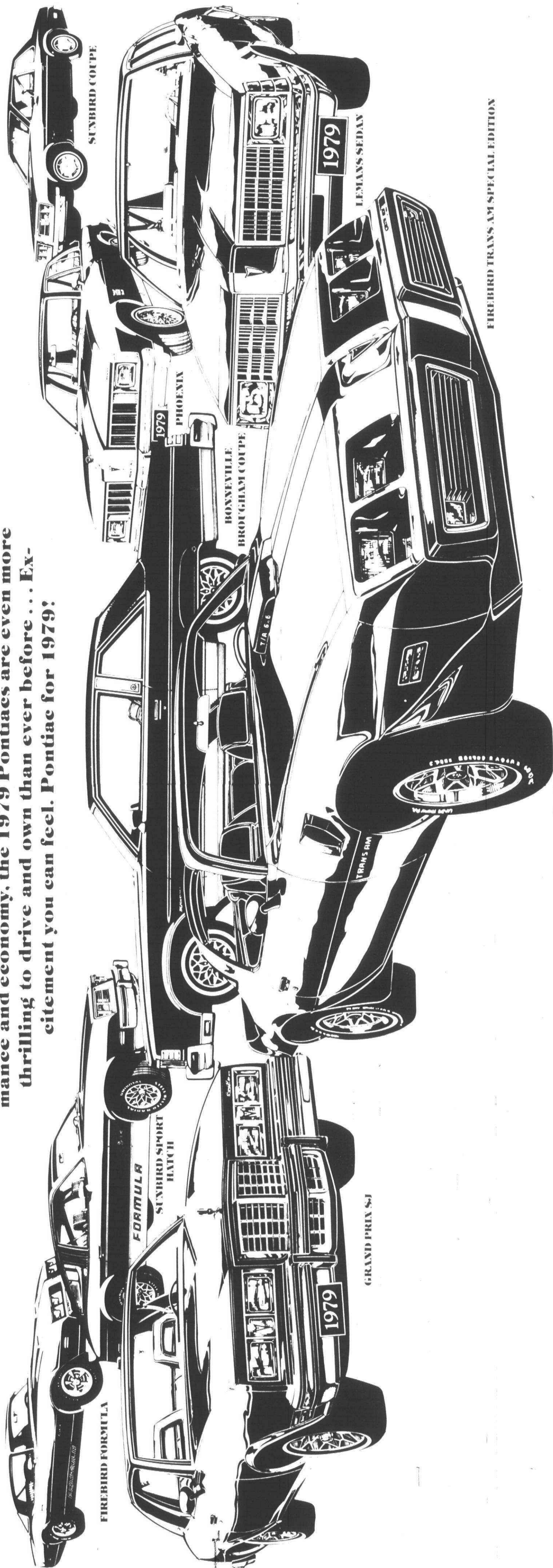

The harness farm system

Betting on horses finances fairs

By W.W. EDGAR

Contrary to popular belief in the state's heavily populated cities, the old-fashioned county fairs are far from just memories of another era—thanks to the para-mutual betting where the harness horses and the runners hold forth for most of the year.

They may not be like they used to, when the harness races provided a relief day for the farmers from the showing of their cattle and crops.

But, according to Racing Commissioner Febele F. Fauri, they're much better because they now are subsidized by the state.

The commissioner, seated in his Plymouth office, pointed out that \$2,126,000 has been appropriated for the betterment of the racing at the various fairs in the state. This money is taken from the state's share of the para-mutual betting that now reaches about \$26 million a year.

This money is appropriated with the thought that it will not only create

more interest in the county fair races with larger purses, but will stimulate interest in breeding of Michigan horses.

As an example of the money used at the county fairs, the commissioner produced a schedule for the past summer which showed eight races with purses of \$25,000.

With a broad grin, the commissioner said there is no betting allowed at the county fairs, except possibly behind the barns.

THIS PAST SUMMER there were 39 fairs in the state that featured harness racing. Of this group, the track at the Midland fair is considered the best. Horses there have been clocked as fast as 2.02 on the half-mile track.

Along with the track at Midland there are others at such places as Crosswell and Adrian that attract some of the best horses.

These races lure such harness racing enthusiasts as Ed Draugelis, the prominent Plymouth attorney, and Jack Richards, the Livonia horseman

who races and breeds the animals at the training grounds at Salem.

The commissioner recalled his early interest in the sport when he raced at the harness tracks while still going to college.

He said the legendary Dan Patch dominated the tracks of the country before his time. But he has found recollections of the famed Single G. a horse that was just about unbeatable and was always on exhibition at the county fairs.

As he spoke of the famed Single G.,

Fauri said it still is looked upon as the horse that time forgot. It was still racing when it was 13 years old.

ANOTHER THING the commissioner explained is that the races at the county fairs are now the "farm system" for the major tracks.

Just as the baseball and football scouts are on the lookout for potential stars, scouts also follow the races.

"The breeders and owners race them as two and three-year-olds at the fairs. After that they move on to the major tracks where they race a fe-

more years. All of this has come about of the subsidization of the county fair tracks with pari-mutual money from the major betting tracks."

The commissioner added that para-mutuals help the county fairs in another way. This year the state appropriated \$2,850,000 for the fairs for prizes, ribbons in the cattle and hog shows, and the other functions that help to make fairs a success.

"No, they are not dead," he said, "Because of the para-mutuals they are bigger and better than ever."

Hilltop fire still under investigation

The Plymouth Township fire department is still awaiting word from the state fire marshal on the cause of the blaze that swept the Hilltop Golf Course clubhouse Oct. 1.

Township fire trucks responded to the fire at the clubhouse, located at Powell and Ann Arbor Trail, according to Sgt. Fred Knupp of the township fire department. Word from the fire marshal is due this week.

He indicated no foul play is suspected.

"The fire started in the bar area in the southwest corner of the clubhouse," said Knupp. "Flames were shooting from the roof when we arrived about 9:30 p.m. Although the fire itself was contained in the south end of the building, the entire inside was damaged by heat and smoke."

The clubhouse was empty at the time of the fire, said Knupp. Manager Dan Ross had left earlier in the evening.

A large percentage of the structure is intact, although the interior will

need some work, as well as the roof where the flames came through," said Knupp.

Ross believes a lit cigarette may have been the cause of the blaze. He was told the fire alarm was ringing in the clubhouse about 8:30 p.m. Sunday. When he arrived, he found a trash can on fire and the room filled with smoke.

Ross removed the burning container and extinguished the fire before opening the doors and windows to let the smoke out, he said.

Ross indicated he then left and returned about 9 p.m. to find the building engulfed in flames. The clubhouse was insured for \$25,000-\$35,000.

A travel trailer will serve as the temporary clubhouse to accept bids to operate the golf club, said Tom Notebaert, township supervisor. He said bids will still be taken until Oct. 17, the date set prior to the fire.

The golf club is owned by the township.

At Plymouth center

Building renovations in works

This is part of a continuing series on the current status of the Plymouth Center for Human Development. Future articles will look at the role of the volunteer at the center and the current view of organized parents of residents.

A large sterile ward with a row of beds lining each dingy brown wall. That's the typical image of an institution.

Most state mental health facilities over the past decade discarded the large wards and impersonal surroundings in favor of smaller, more manageable, more personal, private living quarters.

The Plymouth Center for Human Development, which at one time was home to 1,300 mentally retarded and developmental disabled children and adults, is now beginning to move in that direction.

The center, labeled by some mental

health observers as being "consistently 10 years behind the times," appears to be discarding its "care-taker" philosophy.

Instead of being a 24-hour-a-day, seven-day-a-week home to hundreds of children and adults and nearly 1,300 employees, administrators say they will be funneling more of the mentally retarded back into the community in foster and group homes. Instead of playing babysitter to hundreds, said Director Eranell McIntosh-Wilson, the Plymouth Center will become a "resource center" training the retarded and developmentally disabled for life in the community.

By 1982, she said, the Plymouth Center's population will be reduced from more than 700 to less than 250.

NOT ONLY DOES that mean fewer attendants training fewer persons, administrators say, it means more normal living arrangements.

That means no more large wards.

Instead, residents will live in apartment-like quarters. Instead of grouping four persons to a bedroom, it could mean two-person bedrooms with adjoining living rooms.

It also means that the center's two largest halls, Kennedy and Binet, will be abandoned by 1982, said Assistant Director Ibrahim Hussein. At the height of the controversy over the abuse and neglect of the center's residents, Kennedy Hall housed 159 residents and Binet was home to 149 residents.

Hussein estimated it would cost \$3.5 million to renovate the two halls.

"Between now and then," he said, "people will be living there. So there'll be some immediate improvements. But it won't be a \$3 million deal."

The "immediate improvements," he said, will be cosmetic—new paint, furniture and temporary room dividers.

It will cost about \$200,000, he estimated.

THE OTHER residence halls will be attended to before 1981, he said.

Renovations on Sullivan Hall are scheduled to begin in a several weeks, he said. The remodeling, he estimated, will be completed in August. In the meantime, Sullivan Hall residents will be relocated to other halls where space is available.

He said the relocation is not expected to disrupt the residents.

The remaining halls—Molloy, Howe, Carlson, Willis—will be renovated later.

No plans were mentioned concerning the center's infirmary, which is located above the administrative offices. The administration building is separated from the residence halls by Sheldon Road.

THE SYMPHONY Week placemats were designed by Sue Rothamel, a member of the symphony league. Laurel Furniture Co. paid for the printing of the mats.

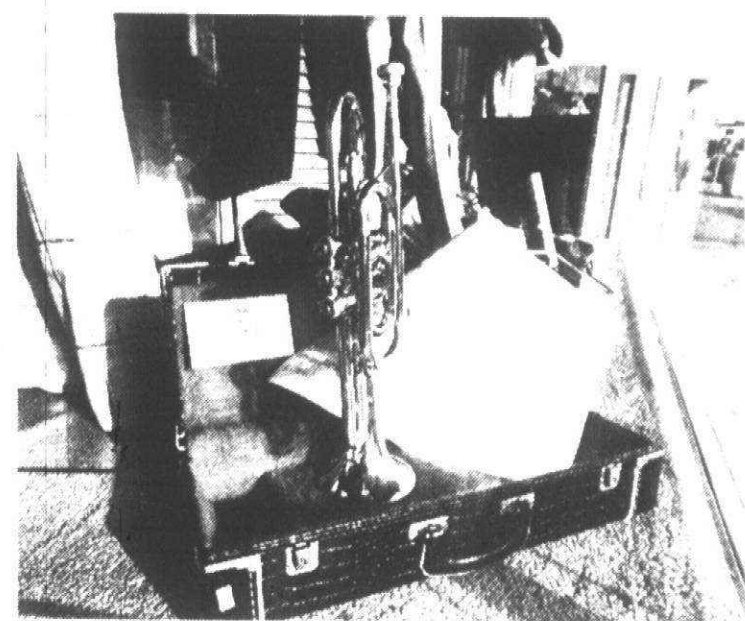
The league provided the Plymouth Symphony Week buttons which will be worn during the week.

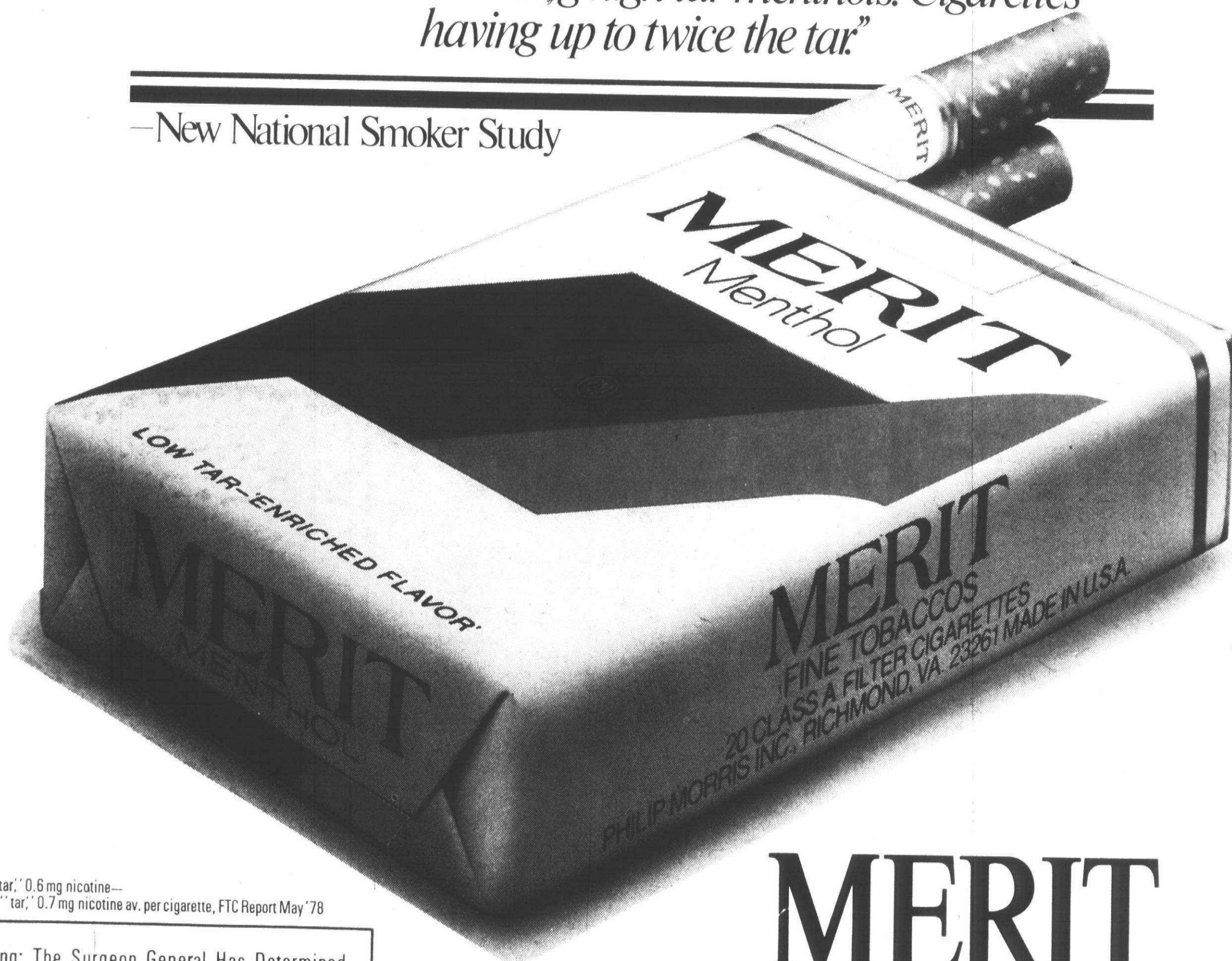

Christmas toy market offers ingenuity, noise

A visit to the Circus World Toy Stores' preview of Christmas toys leaves one bewitched by the ingenuity of toy manufacturers, bothered by the noise (How would you like to listen to a train that sings "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star," against a backdrop of TV commercials?) and bewildered by the variety.

More than 300 manufacturers were represented at the show recently held in Dearborn's Fairlane Manor.

It also leaves one musing over the possibilities of making a fortune by dashing out and buying stock in companies such as Union Carbide or Mallory.

Why? Because they make batteries, of course, and batteries galore are going to be needed this Christmas.

You can expect to find at least one

electronic hand-held game among the Christmas packages. With them, you'll be able to play baseball, football, tennis or race automobiles, while pretending to pay attention to a dull meeting or lecture. You have to wonder what these will do for productivity in plant and school.

On the other hand, there are a lot of pocket electronic outfits to help teach children how to do mathematics, and even how to spell. It's likely much easier on the ego to have a machine tell you you're wrong. Manufacturers range from Texas Instruments to Playskool, which has Alphie, a robot that plays songs and teaches three-year-olds to count.

All take batteries, of course. So do the many pinball machines, designed for experts from three on up, or the electronic skeet-shooting outfit you can enjoy with a friend. The target is

not a clay pigeon, but a beam of light. There's also an executive fly swatter by Hoyle, shaped like a gun, and an outfit called Shoot-Out in Space by Tomy. For bowlers, Marx has a sophisticated electronic bowling game, plus a motorcycle you can "drive" up hills without getting hurt. All that's needed is good coordination.

For those who want to make their own toys, Revell has new Electronic Action Kits, including a Goodyear blimp, a paramedic van and a Coast Guard rescue chopper, complete with flashing lights and sound effects.

Manufacturers are banking on the popularity of the television show "Battlestar Galactica," with all sorts of games and toys and even jewelry based on this theme. For those who missed the television shows, Star Wars equipment and games are still found in abundance.

In the more traditional line, Skill-Craft has new Victorian and Colonial dollhouses you can put together in a few hours for about \$40. They're made of 1/4 inch mahogany plywood. The same company offers a Wooden ToyMaker for kids who want to make their own cars and trucks. If these are too tame, we saw some monster mask kits which would keep the children occupied and scare off any visitors as well.

And if you don't like monsters, look to the dolls. They are very, very appealing, and making a choice is going to be difficult. Whoopie Doll will flip up her pigtales for you, and there's a new doll by Mattel with no strings or batteries. A hug starts her talking. Peanuts and Sesame Street characters are still around, but this year the latter are wearing clothes.

There's an Little Orphan Annie doll, and Mickey Mouse and all his friends are everywhere. They are staging a come-back in honor of his 50th anniversary this year.

There are also Barbie dolls, Cindy Dolls, Donnie and Marie Osmond, joined this year by brother Jimmy, and all their equipment. For the little kids, there's a charming Bug World by Playskool. There are Playmobil characters ranging from firefighters to knights complete with swords and shields, and Kenner has Mountain Tots, new this year.

The stuffed animals seem to be softer and more cuddly than ever, and we like Lamb Chop, a racoon from Grizzly Adams and two small Big Foots (Big Feet?) sitting on a huge Big Foot.

When it comes to dolls and cuddly things, big boys are not forgotten. Our friend flipped over an Adrienne Barbeau poster, "a hot item," the salesman said. We had to settle for a Pink Panther with a "toujours gai" appeal, in the absence of any posters of attractive mature males.

In the realm of sporting goods, it's nice to see that Flexible Flyers are still around and that wagons still look like wagons, but trikes now can look like anything from a mail truck to a Slick Cycle. Kiddy cars also come in all sorts of shapes, including a camel with wrinkled knees.

For would-be pitchers, Rapco has a new baseball trainer that automatically calls balls and strikes. There's also a JumpOLean for active kids, as well as pogo sticks and stilts.

Market Watch

In spite of the securities industry's attempts to make Wall Street "Main Street" to the American public, it is a fact that only one out of every six adults in our country are owners of common stocks.

Considering that the mechanics of Wall Street create and allow the continuing flow of new capital to the industrial complex—from which most jobs are created—it is rather disturbing to know that public interest isn't greater.

Basically, there are three reasons why many folks have never invested in a common stock:

- No funds are available for investment.
- Lack of knowledge about the stock market.
- Fear of loss of principal.

The first reason needs no comment, but the other two do.

Unless an individual studied a commercial course, it is probable that his exposure to the world of finance—even through the college level—was purely perfunctory. We learned the essentials toward bringing home the proverbial bacon, but not much time was spent showing us how to store it!

Still, that is no excuse for ignorance about financial opportunities. There is a wealth of free information for the asking, available from any brokerage office, and most account executives will welcome the opportunity to offer you information and advice concerning your own particular situation.

Lack of knowledge about the stock market can be quickly solved with a simple telephone call!

Fear of loss of principal is certainly a much more valid reason for avoiding the equity market than lack of knowledge. Human instinct leans more toward the warmth of security than it does toward the frigidity of risk.

A recent New York Stock Exchange survey discovered that we are more

security demanding than the Americans who preceded us, and that job guarantees rank higher than job opportunities with many of our younger people.

Risk is inherent in all types of investments, but it is more obvious in some areas than it is in others.

Hard cash or U.S. Government bonds would appear to be as close to a riskless investment (if you can call cash an investment).

From one angle they are, considering the strength of the U.S. Government. But, inflation has slowly eroded the purchasing power of the dollar so that the \$20 bill that you hid in the dresser drawer 10 years ago will buy about 40 per cent less today than it would then.

The best evidence of the ravage that inflation has caused is the real estate market. For what logical reason, other than inflation, could a home built 25 years ago be worth three to four times what it originally cost?

The degree of risk that exists in common stocks will vary with the type of investment chosen. The stock of a utility company, for example, will offer much less risk than an investment in the stock of a brand new venture.

One thing that probably tends to discourage prospective new investors is the extremely high visibility of the stock market. Each day's activity is reported to the finest detail so that everyone knows exactly the price of any stock at any given moment.

Can you imagine the nervousness and uneasiness you might experience if the price of your home was quoted each day in the paper?

Serious investors are not too concerned with day to day fluctuations. They are more concerned with the longer term trend of stock prices.

In the long run, common stocks have proven to be a good place to be.

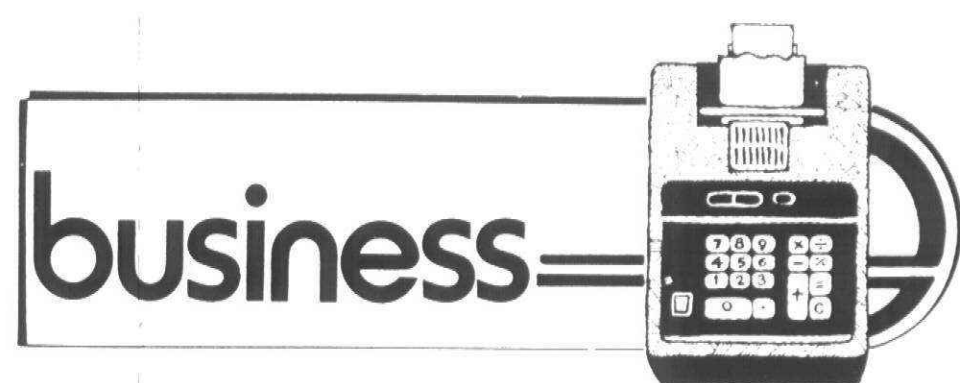

Remodeled theater presents 'Camelot'

Everybody knows the only way to succeed in the motion picture theater business is to build a multi-theater complex served from a single box office and a huge refreshment stand.

And preferably the theater should be in a major shopping center. Or at the very least on a high-traffic thoroughfare with acres of free parking.

Presumably, everybody knows it except Inga Zayti of Northville.

She's bringing back the small-town Main Street theater complete with motion pictures and live stage performances.

Since last April, Ms. Zayti has been busy restoring the 52-year-old P&A Theatre, in the middle of the block in Northville's tiny downtown business district.

It is typical of the small-town theaters that thrived in the pre-TV era of the '20s, '30s and '40s.

ON THE EVENING OF Oct. 14, it will reopen six months after its doors were closed. In recent years, it had been a marginal motion picture operation—second-run movies at \$1.25 per ticket.

Rarely were more than half of its 550 seats occupied for a movie showing.

But on the evening of Oct. 14, its lights will shine on a packed house of first-nighters at the live stage production of "Camelot."

The once-proud Victorian-theme structure will feature a new name—The Marquis—all new seats, carpeting, air conditioning, heating, drapes and from out of the mothballs will come the orchestra pit, footlights and stage.

The Marquis will run both motion pictures and live stage productions. It may be the only theater anywhere mixing movies and stage shows on a regular basis.

After three weekends of "Camelot" at \$8 per ticket, The Marquis will fea-

ture second run movies at \$1.50. Perhaps as often as every two months, new stage productions will interrupt the string of movies.

Inga and her husband, J.J. Zayti, own the theater and Inga operates two women's fashion shops, one on each side of the theater building.

The German-born proprietor has lived in the U.S. for little more than a dozen years. She's determined to bring back an American tradition that few Americans under age 50 can recall.

LET'S PRETEND it is opening night and we are going to "Camelot" at the Marquis.

A bulb-decorated triangular-shaped marquis extends over the sidewalk and its bright, new letters announce that "Camelot" is showing. The theatergoer enters through glass-paneled French doors into a small lobby. On the right is the black walnut ticket booth. Just beyond stands the popcorn machine.

We walk into the inner lobby with its thickly-carpeted floor and marble drinking fountain. Entrances to the men's and ladies' restroom are visible. At the far left and far right are the aisle entrances into the theater proper. Williamsburg chandeliers hang low from the ceiling, elegant red drapes form arches on both walls and match the red carpeting on the descending aisles.

Rows of seats line both sides of the aisles. They are Victorian design with cast iron frames, comfortably cushioned. (Inga says the only other place they are found is at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville.)

Seventeen to 20 musicians file into the orchestra pit. The houselights dim. The maestro lifts his baton. The curtain rises . . . the music begins.

Hopefully, the words from "Camelot" (where "by order summer lingers through September") will prove to be prophetic for The Marquis and it will enjoy "happy ever-aftering" just like "in Camelot."

A number of recent movies—"The Turning Point," "Lumiere"—have dramatized the 20th-Century female dilemma of career versus marriage. "Girl Friends" (PG) brings a refreshing proletarian approach to this now familiar problem.

Susan Weinblatt (Melanie Mayron), a struggling young photographer, (movie makers have a penchant for casting "career" women as photographers), shares an apartment with her friend Annie (Anita Skinner), a struggling young writer.

Annie is blonde, neat and waspish. She's a dilettante, who becomes more dedicated to getting a husband than to advancing her career. Annie explains that she needs someone to depend on.

Susan is distinctly New York Jewish, and she is serious about her professional career. The measure of her dedication is marked by her willingness to earn a living by photographing bar mitzvahs and weddings while awaiting recognition.

ANNE GETS a husband and moves out. Susan is left to cope. She has no one to depend on but herself. She not only has to deal with her loneliness but with economic hardships. Thus Claudia Weill in her directorial debut manages to extract some sharp perceptions about friendship, independence and social climate from a very slim, modest story.

"Girl Friends" says as much about the realities of a young artist struggling for recognition as it does about feminist issues. Susan's daily dose of rejection from magazine editors and others to whom she tries to sell her work gives a clear message. To make it in a highly competitive field requires a lot of inner strength as well as talent.

If Susan has her problems, so does Annie. She is confused and vacillating about the development of her writing career. We find that Annie, with her husband, baby and economic security, still needs Susan as much as Susan, facing the world solo, needs Annie.

This is perhaps the main point of the movie, but it is also the most weakly stated. The two women share an intimacy and rapport which nurtures them both. However, the film never presents the ground work which would establish their relationship.

Where are those scenes which would capture the texture, quality and intensity of their friendship? From all we see, Annie could be one among many interchangeable roommates who help pay the rent.

ONE OTHER ASPECT of this film requires mention and that is the way Annie's husband Martin (Bob Balaban) is presented. Nothing specific is said about him, but there is a subjective tone in the film that seems to sneer at his cultural aspirations or pretensions.

Objectively, his actions are those of a loving, patient and encouraging husband. So why the patronizing smile as if Susan somehow is superior?

"Girl Friends" has several fine moments and flashes of humor that emerge from Vicki Polon's incisive script. It would have more punch if it were more structured and less anecdotal, but it's a notable and entertaining first effort.

'Camelot' riding onto Northville stage

The "Camelot" which opens Oct. 14 in Northville's Marquis Theatre is like the script of an old "Andy Hardy" movie.

Mickey Rooney would say to Judy Garland, "Gee, we could have our own stage show—you'd sing—I'd lead the band—we could have our own arrangements—everyone would have a part—"

That's how actor-director William Premin described the "chemistry" between himself, partner Andrew Henderson and theater owner Inge Zeyti.

The Lerner-Loewe 1962 musical that was so popular in the Kennedy Administration will be the first production of Premin's and Henderson's "Performing Artists Unlimited" in their new headquarters. The Marquis Theatre is the plushly remodeled P&A Theater at 133 E. Main.

The show will run the weekend of Oct. 14-15 (at higher prices because of a champagne reception), Oct. 20-22 and 27-29.

"TO THE playgoer, it's \$12 or \$15 worth of show for a \$6 investment," said the budget-conscious Premin, a Birmingham resident who is purchasing agent for the Troy School District.

The lead roles in the cast alone represent theatrical and musical experience from England, France and Canada as well as the U.S. "It's not professional theater, but it approaches a professional level," Premin said.

Premin, seeking an outlet where "creative people could go out and cre-

ate," formed the company in 1973 with the original intention of multi-media productions—art in the lobby, films, music and acting on stage.

That didn't quite pan out, although they made a little money with last year's critically acclaimed production of "Fiddler on the Roof."

Henderson spotted the "Closed for remodeling" sign on the P&A last spring.

He talked to Mrs. Zeyti and found she had the same dream as Premin and himself—live theater of a high creative level in what was built as a vaudeville house 50 years ago.

His hobby has its own museum

People can tell your age easily in the Oliver Parks Telephone Museum in Springfield, Ill. The older a person is, the more likely he or she is to say, "Hey, I had a telephone like that once."

A visit to the museum at the right time will net a traveller a glance of old Mack Parks himself, the retired telephone lineman who collected these phones and startled everyone at Illinois Bell by walking in off the street one day to offer his collection to the company.

Parks began this hobby in 1949, when he took his telephone truck into a service station for repair and saw a dusty old telephone sitting on a shelf.

"What's that?" he asked.

The woman behind the counter said it was just an old telephone she and her husband had inherited along with the service station.

"Some dummy will give us \$10 for it some day," she said.

Parks, no dummy, did. The phone was an 1898 Stromberg Carlson desk set, now worth more than \$1,000.

Parks' collection began to grow when he retired in 1962. The telephones eventually took over the walls of his house. There were telephones above his furniture, up his stairway

and between his windows.

He especially loved to show them off to his grandchildren, who renamed them for their favorite telephone heroes. One day it occurred to Parks that other people's grandchildren might also like to see the telephones.

A public relations official at Illinois Bell remembers very clearly the day that Parks walked into his office and tried to give away his valuable telephone collection.

"People don't just walk in off the street and give away a collection of old telephones," he said. "But that's exactly what Mack Parks did, and he left us in a dilemma."

When the company finally accepted the collection, it didn't know how to repay Parks. He wouldn't take money. How can a big computerized company take a gift like that from a man of ordinary means?

So they named the museum the Oliver Parks Telephone Museum. For Parks, this was payment enough. Of course, items are always neaten up when they pass from real life into history, so the collection doesn't look quite as it did on Parks' wall in Decatur, Ill.

The phones in the Parks Museum are all dressed up in a 900-square-foot, glass-walled room at the corner of Seventh and Edwards Street in Springfield, at the entrance to the

Illinois Bell building.

The heartbeat of the collection is beyond the glass and steel in the phones that grace the walls and the revolving turnstiles inside.

There are magneto wall phones with

handles, a radio phone of the 1930s, phones with bell-shaped receivers, old wooden wall phones of the early 1900s, and a private branch exchange where operators once said "number please."

The museum's location is an unexpected bonus for most travelers to Springfield, because it sets practically in the heart of the tourist sites related to Abraham Lincoln's life.

Within a few minutes walk, one is on the street where Lincoln and his family lived when he became president. The area, designated an historical district, contains the Lincoln house, one of the few restored homes honest enough to have an outhouse in the back garden.

Walk another few blocks and you can climb the steps to Lincoln's law office, which has also been kept in its 19th century condition.

Across the street from the law office is the Old State Capital, once the center of political, social and cultural life in Springfield. One of the early drafts of the Gettysburg Address is kept under glass there.

Upon completing the brief walking tour around this small area of old Springfield, and you find yourself back at the Oliver P. Parks Telephone Museum, there is one other surprise to be found.

Directly across the street from the museum is the new National Park Service Visitors Center to help you put all of this history into perspective.

a.m. London time, and we are getting ready to land.

Time to rouse oneself, they're serving breakfast. The problem is we haven't yet been to bed.

3:30 a.m. Detroit time. It's 8:30 a.m. in London, and we are landing.

6 a.m. Detroit time. It is 11 a.m. as we leave London for India, and we are preparing for a big lunch. Cocktails madam?

7 a.m. Detroit time—noon over the continent. Lunch consists of salad, meat, rice, vegetables, dessert and wine. My body is saying "What's going on here?"

9 a.m. Detroit time. It's midafternoon over the Middle East and time for another movie.

11 a.m. Detroit time: We open the blinds again after the movie and see that it is dark. We have flown into night.

Somewhere over Earth, I have lost a night and an afternoon. My clock is spinning its wheels, and my stomach is afraid that they are about to serve me another meal.

2:30 p.m. Detroit time: the midnight bells are tolling

and we are about to land in Delhi, capital city of India.

I am flying with members of the Society of American Travel Writers who live east of the Mississippi. Those who live west of the big river are flying the other way around the world out of Los Angeles.

They, too, lose track of meal times and a day, somewhere over the Pacific.

Does anybody know what time it is?

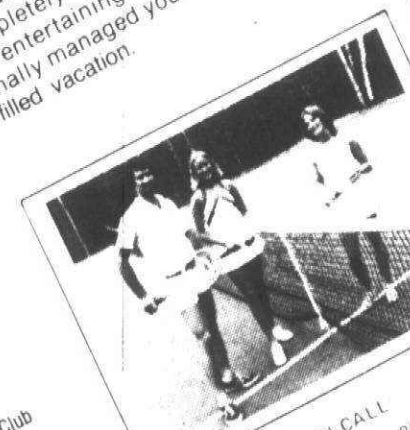

8 strike days made up New S'craft class schedule OKd

Schoolcraft College will use its final examination period and two Saturdays to make up eight days lost because of a strike by faculty and secretaries. Six days late in December and two Saturdays, to be arranged, were announced jointly by the college and the Faculty Forum, bargaining agent for some 350 instructors. Meanwhile, President C. Nelson Grote reported 200 full- and part-time students have withdrawn because of the strike. The loss of their tuition and fees reduced college revenue some \$20,000, he said.

NEW SCHEDULES were distributed on campus last Thursday and Friday. Deadline for withdrawing and receiving full refunds was Friday. But a college spokesman said that in case of "individual or extenuating circumstances," the registrar's office would hear appeals this week. The strike ran from Sept. 25 to Oct. 4, when it was ended by a circuit court order. The college and the unions are

in the process of making their cases to a state fact-finder. The process should be complete early in November. Meanwhile, the board of trustees will meet at 8 p.m. Oct. 18 to deal with projections of lost revenue. Not only did the withdrawals cost \$20,000, but enrollment is down seven to eight per cent this fall—to about 7,700 regular credit students. "If the trend continues into the winter (beginning in January) and spring (May) semesters," Grote told the board recently, "our tuition revenue will be off \$180,000 for the year. We will have to cut expenditures." While the two-year college has never had a deficit, board chairman Paul Kadish added, "it doesn't mean the college is flush with money. There is a potential for a tuition increase. It's something no one wants to do, but . . ."

HERE IS HOW the lost strike days will be made up, according to the college-union agreement:

- "Dec. 15, 16, 18, 19, 20 and 21 will

be added to the fall semester instructional schedule." Five of these days were to have been the final examination period. A college spokesman said instructors who give final exams would probably do so on the last day of class or within the class period. • "Two Saturdays, or other appropriate time, will be arranged in consultation with the students, the instructors and the assistant dean to make up the additional time lost. • "Where such arrangements are not possible, the instructor will offer additional assistance to students.

• "Part-time faculty shall make up time lost in consultation with the students and the appropriate assistant dean, subject to the approval of the coordinator of the office of instruction. • "Counselors will arrange to make up time lost in consultation with the appropriate administrator, subject to the approval of the vice-president for student affairs. • "Librarians will arrange to make up time lost in consultation with the appropriate administrator, subject to the approval of the coordinator of the office of instruction."

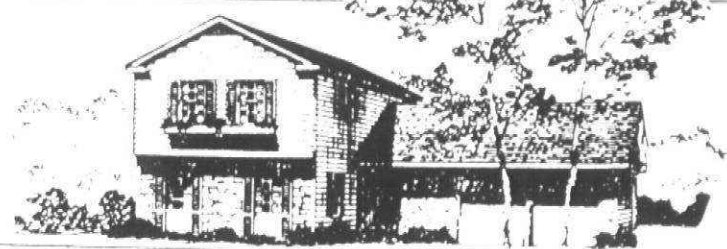

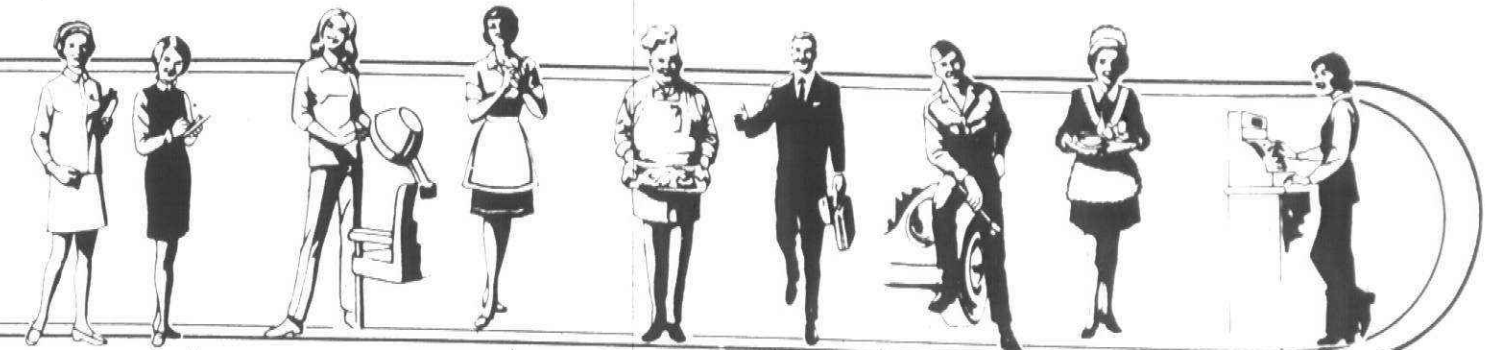

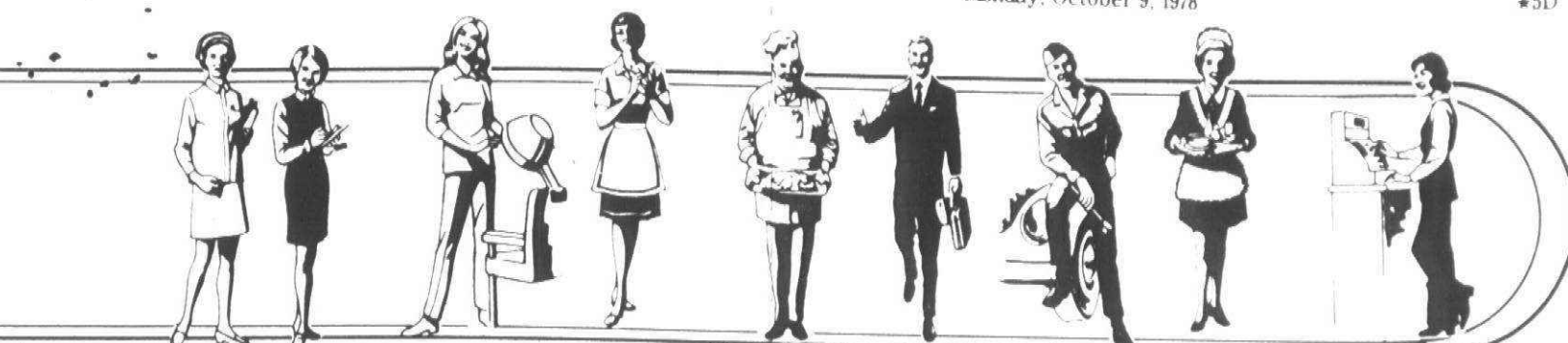
