Board chastised on sign law

A tentative sign zoning ordinance, recently approved by the Canton planning commission, will be reviewed by the Wayne County Planning Commission before any action is taken by the township board of trustees.

The decision to refer the group of regulations for county approval came Tuesday night.

But even as political candidates for township offices rose to accuse the board of attempting to railroad the ordinance through without proper consideration, members of Canton's business community urged quick passage because they said they were in desperate need of signs.

Although the proposed ordinance still restricts the type and size of signs, it gives more flexibility to business persons. Free-standing ground signs would be allowed in some cases.

Business persons who stated their views on the new ordinance said they aren't entirely happy with it, but con-

sider it an improvement over the ordinance now in effect.

Several owners of Canton businesses told the board the present ordinance has caused them hardship because they couldn't erect signs large enough or tall enough to attract customers.

Robert Greenstein, a candidate for township trustee, said board members should answer questions about the ordinance, not planning commission chairman Robert Padgett. Padgett had taken the podium to explain the ordinance and answer questions.

"It gets the board off the hook," Greenstein said. "I'm not taking a position for or against it. But it's too important to have Padgett answer the questions."

Township Clerk John Flodin said, "We haven't done anything yet" to Greenstein's charge that the board was rushing to push the ordinance through.

"You're hollering before you're hurt," Flodin said.

The clerk said the board wasn't going to take any action at the Tuesday meeting because an ordinance can't be acted on the first time it's introduced to the board.

He said the ordinance should probably be sent to the Wayne County Planning Commission for recommendation.

Bruce Phillips, Canton ordinance officer, told the board that the ordinance now in effect had to be redone

at the direction of the county planning commission after the board passed in 1975.

"The board went through it rather quickly and it had made some mistakes," he said.

Phillips had originally been charged to write the new ordinance with the help of Canton's sign and berm committee. Earlier this year, Supervisor Harold Stein asked that he refrain from becoming further involved in the ordinance.

Police call off building probe

The Michigan State Police has refused to conduct an investigation of the Canton Building Department because of insufficient evidence.

The investigation was requested by Supervisor Harold Stein two weeks ago because of evidence he said he unearthed against the building department. The supervisor has repeatedly refused to specify the type of wrongdoing he suspected department.

Stein issued a public apology to building department employees this week following an announcement of state police Lt. William Tomczyk that the investigation has been called off.

Stein tempered his apology, however, by asking "anyone who has any hard facts regarding wrongdoings to bring it to my attention."

"I feel I've fulfilled my obligation to the citizens of Canton," the supervisor said of the investigation.

"The township board's posture is that we want to make it very clear that this investigation should in no way reflect upon the hard-working, dedicated people of that department who have properly fulfilled their duties."

"If this move (for an investigation) has brought any hardship, I would like this to serve as an apology."

Chief building inspector Chuck Thompson said he was unaware of the state police decision to call off the investigation of his department.

"I don't know what's going on yet," Thompson said. "Until we get something in writing from Stein, I'm not going to say anything."

Tisch, voucher knocked

Schools oppose tax proposals

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education is against the proposed Tisch and voucher tax proposals on the Nov. 7 ballot.

But school trustees declined to take a position for or against the proposed Headlee tax limitation amendment.

The board voted 5-1 Monday to oppose Tisch and the voucher, but remain neutral on Headlee. Voting "no" was Flossie Tonda, who was against Headlee. Board president Tom Yack was absent.

The central administration asked the school board to take a position on the three tax proposals to help school officials inform residents of the impact on Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

In earlier unofficial discussions, the trustees had reached a consensus opinion against Tisch and the voucher. Yack had voted at one meeting of school boards against Tisch and the voucher, but in favor of Headlee. Mrs. Tonda, at another gathering of school board representatives, had voted against all three.

THE REASON for neutrality on Headlee, said Supt. John M. Hoben, is that it would not have any serious impact on the district.

"We did an analysis of our revenues for the past four years and found that the Headlee amendment would not have any serious affect on the schools," Hoben said. "The only impact would be on bonding, but we have always asked for a vote of the people on bonding anyhow."

"Headlee could have a serious impact in the future, but how much is unknown now. As one administrator, I think we could live with Headlee but we certainly will be in big trouble if Tisch and/or the voucher plan passes."

Hoben added that the Tisch proposal to cut local property taxes by 50 per cent would result in a \$9 million loss in revenue for Plymouth-Canton the first year. "The expected result would be a doubling of the single business tax, he said, "a one per cent increase in the

income tax, and numerous increases in nuisance taxes.

"The voucher plan would totally eliminate property taxes for schools. The major portion of the lost income if the voucher plan is approved would come from the income tax," Hoben explained. "But, to the best we can determine, Headlee would have little effect on our revenue."

The Metropolitan Association for Improved School Legislation (MAISL), a lobbying group for ten suburban school districts including Plymouth,

opposes all three amendments. Based on informal discussions of the Plymouth-Canton board, Yack voted against Tisch and the voucher and opposed a resolution to oppose Headlee because of the local board's neutrality.

Mrs. Tonda, at a recent meeting of 28 school boards belonging to the Wayne County Association of School Boards, joined in a unanimous vote against all three proposals.

"We had been assuming, based on informal talks, that the board is

against Tisch and the voucher but is taking no position on Headlee," Hoben said. "But we'd like a formal resolution on that position we can use when we inform residents of the impact of these amendments."

The resolution was made by Steve Harper and supported by Elaine Kirchgatter.

"With Tisch and the voucher plan," said Harper, "we as a board would be in the position of not being able to plan

Voters register in droves

A sharp increase in voter registration could mean long lines at the polls next month despite a \$15,000 appropriation from the Canton Board of Trustees for additional voting machines.

Township residents have registered for the Nov. 7 general election "in leaps and bounds," according to Clerk John Flodin.

Since the registration deadline for the August primary, Flodin has accepted applications to vote from more than 2,000 residents.

Tuesday was the registration deadline for residents wishing to cast ballots in the general election.

That means a record 19,300 residents will be entitled to vote next month. Because of the large number of state propositions and local candidates on the ballot, Flodin expects a high percentage of registered voters will show up at the polls Nov. 7.

To minimize the wait in voting lines, Flodin has been authorized by the township board to spend up to \$5,000 for the purchase of 10 used voting machines from the City of Dearborn.

The machines will be used in the precincts with the highest increase in voter registrations.

Flodin expects township officials will have to increase the number of

township precincts next January because of the sharp increase in voter registrations. State law stipulates that precincts with more than 1,400 registered voters must be split after Jan. 1 each year.

Canton's precincts have not been split since January 1977, when the

number of precincts were increased from nine to 16.

Since the last general election in 1976, voter registrations have increased 39 per cent. Township officials estimate Canton's population increase at 30 per cent since 1976.

School board sidesteps elderly housing issue

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has declined to take a position on the desirability of senior citizen housing in Plymouth Township. St. John Episcopal Church is seeking approval from Plymouth Township to rezone church-owned property on Sheldon Road from single-family to multiple use so it can build 42 housing units for the elderly.

The church has received approval for a \$1.4 million loan from HUD but cannot proceed until the land is rezoned by the township board.

Area homeowners had expressed opposition before the Plymouth Township Board because they

did not want multiple zoning alongside single-family use.

ANTICIPATING SOME difficulty when it appears for rezoning permission next month, the church decided to enlist community support and began that effort with an appeal to the school board.

Catherine E. Waynick, senior warden for the church, told school trustees that a wide base of community support was needed and the board's support was being enlisted because the school district is the largest single property owner in the vicinity of the proposed project.

The church property is near West Middle School on Sheldon between Ann Arbor Road and John Alden Street.

"I feel the school board does try to be responsive to the needs of the community, including the needs of adults as well as of children. We are hopeful that responsible groups in the community will support us," Ms. Waynick said.

Dick Reichenbach, a resident living near the church property, said none of the homeowners living nearby are opposed to senior citizen housing, but they are opposed to rezoning the land to multiple use because it's located near single-family homes.

Dick Kaye, who lives on John Alden, said the proposed density of the project is out of proportion with the size of the property.

He added that the Sheldon and Ann Arbor Trail intersection is already congested, and a senior citizen project would only increase the traffic problem.

Kaye also said that senior citizens like to be able to walk to stores, restaurants and doctor offices, and they couldn't do those things at the church site.

SCHOOL TRUSTEES listened to Mrs. Waynick and residents, but were already determined—before taking a final vote—not to get involved in a township zoning matter which is a municipal responsibility.

The vote against taking any position was 5-0 with Flossie Tonda abstaining.

Mrs. Tonda said she abstained because she knew nothing about Plymouth Township's zoning ordinance and couldn't cast an informed vote.

Trustees Steve Harper and Joe Gray asked why the item had come before the board, and Supt. John M. Hoben said it was on the agenda at the request of the church.

"I question whether this board should make a decision for or against this unless it has a direct impact on the school district per se," said Richard Arlen, board vice-president.

"If it had a direct impact, we could make it known to the government involved what our position is as a matter of information. But I don't see the need to get involved on this one."

Arlen and trustee Elaine Kirchgatter said that defeat of the church's request for support was not to be interpreted as non-support for housing for the elderly.

"I am voting 'no' because the school board has no responsibility for zoning in Canton, Plymouth Township or in the City of Plymouth," Mrs. Kirchgatter said.

Fund loss curbs home services

It may be a long hard winter for the area's senior citizens.

That bleak forecast is the result of a recent \$4,000 loss in funds by the home services area of the Plymouth, Canton, Northville YMCA. The area assists seniors over 60 with home maintenance and an escort service.

According to Janet Luce, YMCA director, home services received \$21,000 in federal and state funds this year as compared to \$25,853 last year.

"I feel just terrible about this," said Ms. Luce. "We're going to have to cut back our services because of this loss."

Ms. Luce attributed the fund loss to "across the board cuts" by the Detroit Wayne County Area Agency on Aging. The funds originate from the federal and state governments, and are distributed by the agency.

"The funds were cut because we had fewer dollars with which to work ourselves," said Bill Priest, grant coordinator at the agency. "Last year we had \$1.8 million, while this year we had a projection of \$1.6 million."

He indicated the amount of money an area gets depends on such things as the number of seniors in need of services and sometimes the particular agency's performance.

Many areas were affected by the cutbacks—the Plymouth-Canton area wasn't singled out, said Priest. However, he said things may be looking up in the next few months.

"We may receive some supplemental funds from other sources which we can distribute. It's hard to say right now, but there is a possibility."

IN THE MEANTIME, the home services branch of the YMCA must make do with what is available now. There are other problems besides the cut in funds, according to Ms. Luce.

"We've been told by the agency that we must service more minority seniors and those on low income (\$2,500 or less per year.) We can't just drop people we've been helping to take on more, but with the loss in funds, we have to. We also aren't allowed to ask someone his income, so how are we to know if he qualifies as a low-income senior?"

Ms. Luce is upset because the agency has cut the funds but insisted the home services program help a greater number of people. "It looks as if as the number of people we must service increases, the dollars decrease."

She also is unhappy about the fact that Detroit, for instance, receives more funds than this area.

According to Priest, Detroit receives 70 per cent of the funds while out Wayne County receives 30 per cent. He attributes this to the higher concentra-

tion of low income, minority seniors in the Detroit area.

"We need it here too," Ms. Luce said. "These people have worked all their lives and now need help that we just can't give. I'm really down in the dumps about the whole thing."

THE HOME SERVICES area of the YMCA provides seniors with lawn services, grass cutting and snow shoveling, housecleaning and an escort service on errand trips.

A substantial number of these employees are paid by the funds, but there are a number of volunteers, said Ms. Luce. She added the bus donated by the Lions Club is a help, but quits running at 1 p.m. each day.

Ms. Luce said the YMCA may receive additional funding for the program from other sources, but nothing is definite yet.

"We're going to take a stab at helping as many people as we can. But we do want the public to know why we're going to have to cut our services."

Farmland preservation meeting set

A meeting to answer questions Canton residents may have about a farmland preservation program in the township will be held beginning at 7:30 p.m. Oct. 18 at the Plymouth-Canton High School auditorium.

The meeting, which will feature a slide show pointing out the pros and cons of farmland preservation through the purchase of development rights, is open to the public.

On the November ballot, voters will be asked to approve the levying of as many as four mills to institute a development rights purchase program.

Music magic nears 20th year

There are many things that can be said for anyone's hometown. But what person can tell a tale of his or her hometown that comes close to that of a tale told by someone from the Plymouth-Canton area?

What do other communities have that compares to a four-day Fall Festival with fish fries and chicken barbecues, or the town chicken races that have just flown by? And what other community has had a community band playing in the bandshell under the stars for the past 20 years?

There is a possibility that many of the persons in the large Kellogg Park audiences for those six concerts from June until August do not know how the band got its start.

Local historians see it this way: Back in the spring of 1959, five enthusiastic musicians got together to form a band of some kind, no matter whether it be a German Oom-pah band, Dixieland band or other. The first performance of this group was Plymouth's Fourth of July parade.

Its performance captivated the sidewalk audience and drew more musicians into the group. That quintet grew into the community band everyone knows today.

OF THOSE original five, two still participate in the band year-round. They are joined by many other long-term members.

Keith Burton and Bill Upton, the remaining duo of the original quintet, are joined by people like Clayton

LeRoue, Jack Wells and Vic Ferrari.

Besides being members of the band for so many years, these musicians also have contributed greatly to the existence of the band. LeRoue and Wells are president and treasurer. Ferrari is acting equipment manager.

Other members of the band have contributed to its success. Doug MacLeod, librarian, supplies everything in marches from Sousa to King out of his own personal music library. John Monk lends his engineering abilities to the band by recording all the concerts. Paula Lindsey is the band's secretary.

PERHAPS, TO the surprise of many people, the Plymouth Community band performs more than the six concerts-in-the-park series. As many as 22 concerts are performed during the winter season.

In past years, the band has played at Greenfield Village for both the Country Fair in the spring and the Harvest Festival in the fall. Cobo Hall graduations, the Chelsea and Arnold retirement homes, and local shopping centers are just a few of the band's "off-season" commitments.

For most of its 20 years, the band was directed by James R. Griffith, conductor of bands at the Centennial Educational Park and the school district's musical coordinator.

Presently, the band is directed by Robert G. Burr. Burr is also the musical director and principal conductor of the Plymouth Youth Symphony Orchestra.

Schools nix tax cut, voucher bids

and implement an education program for next year. This is particularly so with the voucher plan because we wouldn't know until almost the beginning of school how much money we'd have. With Tisch, any educational program we'd have would just be window dressing.

"With Headlee," Harper added, "the potential fund problems are longer-range and we most likely could run a reasonable educational program next year. We do know, though, that with Tisch we'd cut one-third of our program right off the bat, and with the voucher, there's no way of knowing how much money we'd have to work with."

Mrs. Tonda said she was against all three because none of the amendments were "good for kids. We should set up leadership against things which are bad for kids. I can't say I'm neither for or against Headlee because it's not true—I'm against Headlee."

Mrs. Kirchgatter argued that it shouldn't be assumed the board favors Headlee.

Joe Gray echoed that position. "By not taking a stand on Headlee, we just aren't doing anything about that particular amendment. Personally I'm in favor of Headlee, but I'll support a

board resolution to be neutral. I think we must explain to residents what these amendments mean to our district, and then the voters will decide."

Trustee Carol Davis commented: "I'd hate to be interpreted as urging passage of Headlee because we aren't taking a stand against it. It looks like we are saying Headlee is least offensive. Maybe we should say it's no good."

The board also urged the administration to conduct an educational campaign to inform residents of the impact on the district of the three proposals.

ARGUMENTS MADE against the voucher proposal include:

- Renters would receive no property tax breaks, but would pay a greatly increased income tax up to at least 6.9 per cent.

- With more than 200,000 private school children added as financial responsibility of Michigan taxpayers, the legislature would have to increase state taxes by an even greater amount (at least \$300 million) than needed to merely replace the income lost from the property tax.

- Nonresident owners of property in Michigan would receive a windfall property tax break, with Michigan tax-

payers stuck paying additional amounts in income and other taxes to offset the break given to nonresidents.

- Professional and service businesses, already hard hit by the single business tax, would be faced with at least another 2.3 per cent increase in the SBT.

- Nonpublic schools will lose their independence and autonomy as they will be required to subscribe to the same governmental controls, programs, audits and employment practices as public schools.

- The method of implementing the proposal is completely unknown—so is the value of the voucher. Voters thus are asked to approve an unknown school funding scheme, and to trust the legislature and the state to provide still another bureaucracy for its implementation.

ARGUMENTS MADE against the Tisch proposal included:

- The proposal seriously jeopardizes ability of schools and the state to continue to fund education programs, even at current levels because the income tax limitation, if passed, would not replace the property tax loss.

- The proposal threatens local control of public schools. The increased dependency on the state to support public education would result in a shift of power and control from local school boards to the state.

- Nonresident businesses and individuals who own property in Michigan but live elsewhere would get a 50 per cent tax break while Michigan citizens would pay more in other taxes.

- The Tisch proposal does not necessarily provide overall tax relief to low and middle income taxpayers.

Bus fixers recognized

The crew of bus mechanics were honored for high achievement at Monday night's meeting of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Calvin Heard, chief mechanic for the district, was presented with certificates issued by the Michigan State Police and by the Michigan Department of Education.

The certificates were in recognition of the fact that the bus mechanics scored 100 per cent on the school bus inspection program for 1977-78.

Supt. John M. Hoben pointed out there were only about three districts statewide which scored 100 per cent, other than Plymouth-Canton, and of these only one district had a similar size bus fleet.

The bus mechanics, under Heard's leadership, have passed the safety inspection with a 100 per cent score for five successive years now—a singular achievement statewide.

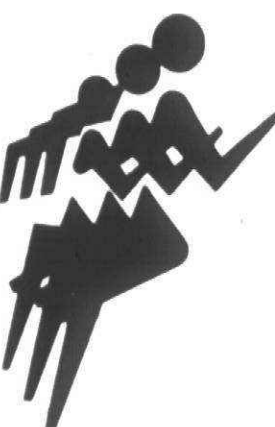

Residents win commercial ban

Township agrees to land settlement

A four-year clash over land development in the southwest area of Plymouth Township is drawing to a close without a court battle.

Beating a trial deadline by a few weeks, attorneys for Plymouth West Three Associates, owners of about 130 acres bounded by Ann Arbor Road, Joy, Ridge, and Colony Farms subdivision, and township attorneys tentatively have agreed to a consent judgment regarding zoning of the land.

The judgment (an agreement between the parties authorized by the court) will allow single-family and

multiple zoning on the large piece of property, banning commercial and/or office zoning originally sought by the owners and developers.

Similar to the agreement reached over land owned by Plymouth West Two Associates last year, the judgment also allows township engineering of specifications and location and design of sanitary and storm sewer facilities.

Township officials were pleased with the outline of the proposed agreement, noting that neighboring residents who protested commercial and office zoning would be appeased. An open space plan also will be included in future development.

SPECIFIC ZONING will allow a maximum of 72 multiple condominium units in the northeast section of the property and 225 single-family units in the remainder of the acreage.

The proposed developer, Angelo Spagnoli, will be limited to construction on 113 of the approximate 130 acres of property.

According to Donald Morgan, township attorney, the proposed judgment will satisfy the needs of the township while allowing development to begin.

A court trial may have jeopardized township desires to avoid commercial and/or office zoning on the property, he said. Neighboring residents' protests of the zoning originally initiated the legal hassle four years ago, officials confirmed.

Plymouth West Three Associates, a co-partnership with Gregory Donovan as the major partner, plans to sell the property to Spagnoli for development. Under terms of the agreement, Spagnoli will pay for a site evaluation by Norman L. Dietrich Associates, township planners and engineers.

The site evaluation shall determine location and dimensions of lots in the single-family portion, location of open space, and location of multiple-unit buildings, within the agreed guidelines.

That stipulation allows township monitoring of the development of the large site. Under the agreement, the site will be developed with 90 per cent single-family and less density than allowed under the future land-use plan of the township.

Township officials were unable to

put a price tag on the legal costs during the four-year hassle. Township Atty. Morgan is paid on a contractual basis, according to Clerk Helen Richardson, and costs are not computed on a per-case basis.

Morgan also refused to speculate as to the legal costs of the lengthy negotiations. He did speculate that looming trial dates typically expedite negotiations to avoid costly trial work.

The three amendments will be on the Nov. 7 ballot.

Baking 200 loaves of bread each week day morning might be a monotonous job to some people but it just a routine assignment to Howard Wendel, owner of Terry's Bakery on Ann Arbor Trail.

He has been doing this to supply his Plymouth customers for the past eight years and thinks nothing of baking the bread and then switching to such tasty baked goods as Danish pastry, French pastry, fried cakes, donuts and a variety of wedding cakes.

You just fall right into it, he tells you. When you know it has to be done, you do it. It becomes second nature and a fellow would feel funny if he didn't have the job to do.

WENDEL TOOK over the bakery from the Terrys whose name had been a byword in Plymouth for years and he has been busy baking in the rear of the store for the past eight years.

When Wendel moved here from Allen Park, where he had a bakery for 11 years, he realized that he had the Terry's reputation to meet. It wasn't an easy assignment. But he brought 32 years of experience with him and the bakery continues to be a popular place, even to folks from neighboring communities.

He received his baptism in the bakery business when he returned for the war in 1946. At the time his brother,

Ray, had a bakery at Joy Road and Evergreen, so it was a natural thing that he was put to work immediately.

During his years in military service Wendel was a member of the 99th Division and served in the European Theater. He chuckles now when he recalls that his group was known as the "Battle Doggies."

Once inoculated in to the bakery business, he decided to make it his life's work. As a result he opened a bakery of his own in Allen Park and prospered.

HOWEVER, WHEN THE Terrys decided to sell the business in Plymouth and take things easy in Florida, Wendel grasped the opportunity to meet the challenge of a living up to the Terry name.

Now, with the aid of two sons, Jay and Larry, the three of them join in the bread baking and creating the various varieties of pastries and cookies. Wendel admits that some of the recipes are his own and he explained that much of the success he has enjoyed, while continuing the Terry name in the business, is the fact that they use only the highest quality ingredients.

"We don't use any substitutes like you will find in much of the baked goods in the supermarkets."

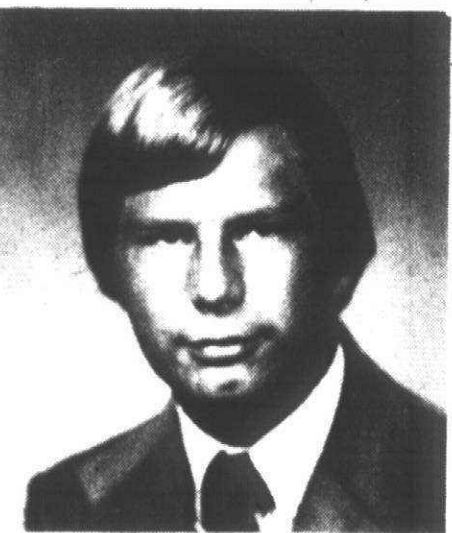
It is this success he has experienced since moving to Plymouth that keeps of job of baking 200 loaves of bread each day from becoming monotonous.

Mystery youth disease prompts disco benefit

One year ago Lindsey Muehl was a healthy three-year-old, until she was afflicted with Reyes syndrome.

Within a few days, she was near death, but Lindsey was one of the lucky children—she survived. After months of hospitalization, she was blind and suffered from brain damage.

Now, at four, Lindsey is slowly recovering from the quick-acting, often fatal disease that strikes more often in Michigan than any other state.

But few parents are familiar with the disease and its often disguised symptoms; and the West Suburban Affiliate No. 39 of the Michigan Cosmetologist Association wants to alter that situation.

From 4 p.m. to 2 a.m. this Sunday at "The Twilight Zone" at Warren and Merriman Roads in Westland, the affiliate is sponsoring a disco dance and contest. The \$5 admission goes to the Children's Hospital and the Reyes Syndrome Research Study Center.

With a target goal of \$25,000, the affiliate is hoping to play a part in helping doctors at Children's Hospital uncover the mysteries of this strange disease which strikes from infancy to adolescence. But alerting parents to the disease itself parallels the need to raise funds, says one spokesman.

"MOST PEOPLE have never heard of it," says one Plymouth shop owner who asked to remain anonymous. He, like other cosmetologists involved in the fund-raising effort, don't want publicity for their shops. Like the major-

ity, they were unaware of the disease until it struck within a member's family.

Judy Muehl of Westland was a trustee on the cosmetology board when Reyes Syndrome struck her daughter last year. Her experience convinced the group to devote their time and effort to alerting the public of the killer disease this year.

"If you don't know the symptoms, you might think a child has the flu," says the spokesman.

Early symptoms are persistent vomiting, fatigue and drowsiness, personality change, disorientation and delirium, convulsions, and dilated pupils, according to Children's Hospital.

Reyes Syndrome usually strikes after a viral illness such as the flu or chickenpox. The child may be recovering from the first illness and almost

be ready to return to school when the symptoms of the disease appear.

EARLY DIAGNOSIS is imperative if treatment has a chance for success. Sudden, persistent vomiting almost always is the first sign. Soon after, the child may become totally irrational—screaming, striking out, biting, and unable to recognize family members.

There is nothing that can be done for the child at home, doctors warn. It is

better to be over-cautious in a situation where suspicions are aroused. Don't hesitate in taking your child to the nearest emergency room if your own physician is unavailable, they stress.

The combination of symptoms often arouses the suspicion of drug abuse,

particularly in a teen-age patient, they add.

Cases appear throughout the year but with the greatest frequency in the winter months of January through March. The illness strikes most often in suburban and rural areas, and Michigan reports the highest number

of cases in the country, while other Great Lakes states also have a larger percentage of cases than other areas of the country.

Reyes Syndrome affects the liver and brain causing massive cell deterioration in these organs. Unless successfully treated, death can follow.

Plymouth cited for safety

The City of Plymouth has been awarded a pedestrian safety citation by American Automobile Association (AAA) for two years without a pedestrian traffic fatality.

Plymouth is one of 50 Michigan cities to receive an award in the 39th annual AAA Pedestrian Safety Inventory. A record of 2,656 U.S. towns plus 29 states participated in the annual program.

Panel members pan effects of Headlee, Tisch

A panel of financial experts from Wayne and Oakland counties said Michigan can look forward to a regressive tax system, higher governmental fees and a loss of local control if the so-called Headlee and Tisch constitutional amendments are approved at the polls Nov. 7.

Communities will lose their ability to bond and lure industry, and mandated federal and court programs will eat up restricted budgets, they said.

Services to citizens—particularly in higher education—will either be reduced or priced out of the market for many citizens, they said in a public forum last week sponsored by Schoolcraft College.

Spokesmen from Wayne County, Oakland Community College, K-12 school districts and Wayne State University had one of their few opportunities to appear on the same platform with advocates of the Headlee amendment and Robert Tisch himself. It was one of five forums on the Nov. 7 ballot proposals, all on Thursday evenings.

EVEN WITHOUT one of the constricting amendments, Wayne County is writing a "crisis budget," said Commissioner Mary Dumas (R-Livonia).

"The sheriff is threatening to sue. The judges are threatening to sue. We don't quite know what we will do if you give us Headlee and Tisch," she said, pointing out that neither amendment makes provision for court-mandated spending.

Mrs. Dumas praised one provision of the Headlee amendment: If the state mandated local spending, the state would have to fund it.

But she added that the Headlee plan says state aid to local units cannot be reduced "as a lump, but there's nothing to prevent diversion of funds from Wayne County to Oakland or from Livonia to Detroit."

While she wasn't extremely worried about the Headlee effect, Mrs. Dumas called the Tisch plan "far more critical." It would reduce local property assessments by half, allowing the state income tax to increase from 4.6 per cent to 5.6 per cent. "This would shift the tax burden from local government to the state," she said. "It would shift local control to the state."

TUITION HIKES would be a logical result if either of the tax reform proposals pass, said W.H. Nikkel, vice-president for business and finance of Oakland Community College.

"If our valuation is reduced in half (under Tisch), we would have to discuss what we get from the state," Nikkel said. And if state aid weren't sufficient, tuition—which is non-tax income—could be increased.

Noting the Headlee amendment would require all bond issues to be submitted to a popular vote, Nikkel said the four-campus OCC "would not have had the facilities we have" under such circumstances.

The amendments could cause problems when colleges are required to

increase retirement benefit funding and whenever the federal government passed a social security tax increase, Nikkel said.

FOUR-YEAR colleges would be hard hit by the amendments, said Charles F. Sturtz, vice-president for business and finance of Wayne State University.

He likened the amendments' effect to the budget-cutting that goes on statewide during a recession: Mental health and social services couldn't be cut, so four-year colleges would bear the brunt of the cuts. Sturtz served in the state budget office before joining WSU.

He called the \$5 billion budget surplus California had before the passage of Proposition 13 "flat unscientific." But Michigan has had no such surplus and requires no such remedy, he said, adding: "We have had responsible, effective government in Michigan."

THE TISCH amendment may cut property taxes, but it will require

other kinds of tax increases, said Gerald Dunn, a school district lobbyist in Wayne and Oakland Counties and a University of Michigan regent.

Besides the one per cent increase in the state income tax, the Tisch amendment would allow school districts to go to the voters and ask for a one per cent school district income tax for replacement money.

Under Headlee, Dunn said, municipalities would be unable to float industrial development bonds without a popular vote. This will hurt Michigan as it competes for industry with other states, he said.

Tisch supporters, he said, have overlooked the so-called "circuit breaker" in the property tax—that is, when local property taxes rise above a certain percentage of one's income, the taxpayer gets a partial reimbursement from the state.

"The circuit-breaker has been working," added Dan Wellburn, lobbyist for the Michigan Education Association.

Wellburn said the Tisch amendment, by holding down assessments below market value growth, "may shelter

substantial wealth. Is that the kind of economic policy you want?"

TOM GORTON, Wayne County chairman of Taxpayers United for Tax Limitation, the group led by Farmington insurance executive Richard Headlee, and Shiawassee County Drain Commissioner Tisch, repeated the arguments they have used in other presentations.

Gorton said "state spending in 10 years increased 235 per cent versus a 140 per cent increase in our ability to pay for it."

He added, "Tisch limits the property tax, but not the other 40 avenues of taxation open to the state." In contrast, he said, the Headlee amendment would put an overall cap on state and local taxation.

Tisch said the philosophy of the tax cut movement is that "we want some less government than we're paying for. We want government to be cost-effective. I intend for taxes to be lighter as new construction comes on stream."

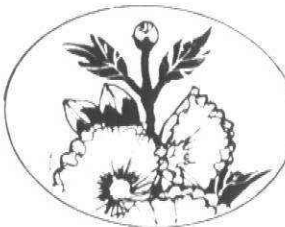

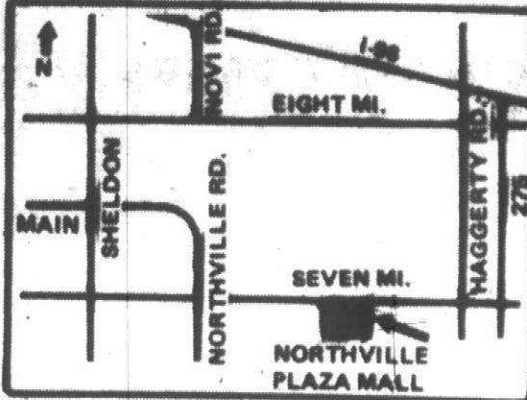

Rely on roots

Future has perspective-Williams

Michigan Supreme Court Justice G. Mennen Williams was in Plymouth recently to address the first fall meeting of the Michigan Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR).

The luncheon meeting of the state chapter was held in the Round Table Club of the Mayflower Hotel.

Williams is a 38-year member of the SAR. The SAR's purpose is to encourage historical research related to the American Revolution, preservation of records of original participating patriots as well as Revolutionary War relics and landmarks and to celebrate anniversaries marking that period.

JUSTICE WILLIAMS began his address with an appeal for citizens to maintain a sense of perspective:

"The swirling eddies of today's events could carry us off in any one of several directions. The Cassandra prophets of gloom and doom could drain us of the last ounce of hope and energy, while the Polyanna visionaries could cut us off from the rock of reality and the understanding that the future belongs only to those who deserve it.

"When we look at the vivid and complex world of 1978, it is the gospel of

wisdom, I think, to try to maintain a sense of proportion and perspective.

"It is sensible to find out what we can about our past, our roots, and the rock from whence we are hewn."

The justice then quoted Edmund Burke, "Men who know not their history are as flies in summer."

"Only when we understand ourselves can we successfully plan and achieve our future. Perhaps too many people today live too much in the present. The world did not begin when we were born.

"Many of us have read Alex Haley's novel 'Roots' or have seen the Hollywood film. Many Americans have gone to the archives and libraries to discover what they can about their own 'roots.'"

"It is indeed a desirable thing for Americans, all Americans, to try to know more about their inheritance, who their ancestors were, what they did and tried to do, what were their hopes, how they dreamed dreams and made some of them possible.

"It is an excellent thing to know something of our family histories. It is also exceedingly important to know as much as we can about the origin and

growth of significant American ideas and ideals, about liberty and law, about symbols—the thunderbolts and the olive branches as well as the eagle."

WILLIAMS STRESSED that much of the spirit of the American experiences is lost in the factual textbook study of history and in the mere observance of anniversaries.

"We too often celebrate in form and forget the substance and meaning

"It is often desirable to remind Americans that many of the main elements of the American constitution and laws were made in the hot-blooded drama of American history by men toughened in the fields of battle, the courts of law, and the cockpits of politics.

"Most of these men were realists, hard-headed fellows like ourselves. They lived in a world of enterprise, action, tall ideas.

"And most of them knew what they were talking and writing about. Their words were usually precise, simple, and clear."

The former governor of Michigan and former U.S. ambassador then spoke on the importance of the individual in a democracy.

"In the center of the whole democratic process is nothing more and nothing less than the ideal of the ultimate freedom and importance of the individual."

"We know of no better way to ensure the freedom and dignity of the human personality than is provided by the democratic system of government, which provides each of us with those important rights that must never be disregarded—the right to speak out on issues of concern to us and the right to cast our ballots."

Stress put on youth

"Building America Today for Tomorrow" is the theme of the national president of the Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars who recently carried that message to Michigan.

Mrs. Arlene McDermott visited Michigan as part of her nationwide tour to alert America to the urgency of building America today for tomorrow.

Mrs. McDermott, representing some 600,000 VFW Auxiliary members dedicated to patriotism and service from 51 states and the District of Columbia, brought to the 30,000 members of the Michigan Ladies Auxiliary the plans of the nationally-chartered organizations for the coming year.

Representatives from Mayflower Auxiliary 6695 of Plymouth who attended the conference were: Juliette Swartout, state patriotic instructor;

Dorothy Holmberg, president of the local Auxiliary; Lenora Glidden; Jean Hendrickson; Helen Leader; Esther Guldner; Veneta Hornbeck; Grace Burley; and Eileen Williams.

Mrs. McDermott stressed the need to build America by working with youth, legislators, parents and educators. Some 315 Auxiliary units from across Michigan was represented at the annual fall conference held at the Bay Valley Inn in Bay City.

Mrs. Betty Connelly, state president, presided over the three-day meeting of more than 2,000 local officers and chairmen from throughout Michigan. Agenda items included instruction seminars from state chairmen on membership, hospital work, rehabilitation, youth services, public relations, and cancer aid and research.

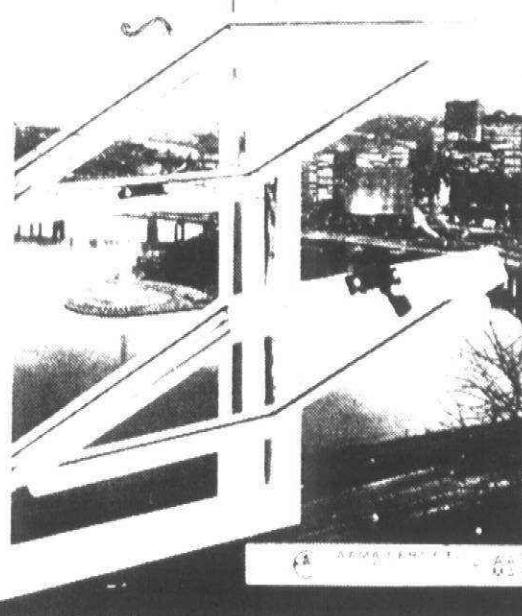

LWV probes Tisch, Headlee

Proposition E Headlee Amendment

The issue: Should the State constitution be amended to limit all state taxes and revenues to their current proportion of total state personal income?

The state constitution presently requires an annual balanced state budget, and limits the property tax rate that may be levied by local units of government without a vote of the people. Local units of government are also required by law to have a balanced budget.

Many taxpayers feel that government bureaucracy is growing too rapidly, and the increase in state spending is far out of proportion to the increase of the personal income of the people of Michigan.

Petitions filed by Taxpayers United, Inc. would amend the constitution by limiting the ability of the legislature to increase state taxes beyond their current proportion of the total personal income. This is a tax limitation cov-

ering all taxes in the State of Michigan, not a cut.

Many opponents feel the proposal is too restrictive and could cause vital services to be cut.

The proposal would limit state taxes and spending to 2 percentage—determined by the state budget for fiscal year 1979, and expected to be between 9.15 and 9.48 per cent—of the state's personal income.

The personal income of Michigan (PIM) is defined by the proposal as the total income received by persons in Michigan from all sources as reported by the U.S. Department of Commerce. Federal aid is excluded in calculating this income.

If the economy expands and personal income grows, the legislature would automatically have more money to work with because it is receiving a percentage of this income, but the legislature cannot increase its percentage without a vote of the people.

However, in the event of a state emergency, the spending limits could be exceeded for that fiscal year by joint action of the governor and legislature (two-thirds vote of both houses).

If total state revenues exceed the limit by one per cent or more in any fiscal year, they are to be refunded pro rata to those who paid state income tax or single business tax in that year.

Revenues which exceed the limit by less than one per cent may be placed in a budget stabilization fund.

Local governments would be prohibited by Proposal E from adding new or increasing taxes without voter approval. Currently local government may issue bonds without a vote of the people and levy taxes to pay off the bonds.

Although the proposal excluded taxes authorized for repayment of principal and interest of existing bonded indebtedness, new bonding

would require voter approval. The proposal does not prohibit municipalities from establishing "user fees" (i.e., library services and garbage pick-up).

In the case of property taxes, if the state equalized valuation of an assessment district is raised, the tax rate must be reduced so that the yield of dollars is the same as before or does not increase more than the consumer price index.

The proposal does not guarantee that individual pieces of property will remain the same; the limit is on the total valuation for the municipality.

Under the Headlee amendment, the state would be prohibited from adopting new or expanding present local programs without full state funding (to prevent shifting the burden to the local level).

More forums on the issues

Schoolcraft College's Liberal Arts theater will be the scene of four more public forums on Michigan's Nov. 7 ballot proposals. All begin at 7 p.m. on Thursdays (including tonight). The building is at the south end of the campus at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.

Tonight's forum will be on Proposal H—the so-called "voucher" plan. Speakers will be Dan Veldman, of Citizens for More Sensible Financing of Education (pro), and Margaret Foerch, of the Western Wayne County Council Against

Parochialism (against).

Oct. 12's discussion will be on Proposal A, for a new constitutional convention. Speakers will be Dennis Stabenow, of Citizens for a Constitutional Convention (pro) and State Rep. Jack E. Kirksey (R-Livonia) (against).

The Oct. 26 forums will be on Proposal K, denial of bail, and Proposal B, parole reform.

The Nov. 2 topics will be on Proposal D, raising the drinking age to 21, and Proposal G, collective bargaining for state police troopers.

CHIROPRACTORS SEEK RESEARCH VOLUNTEERS

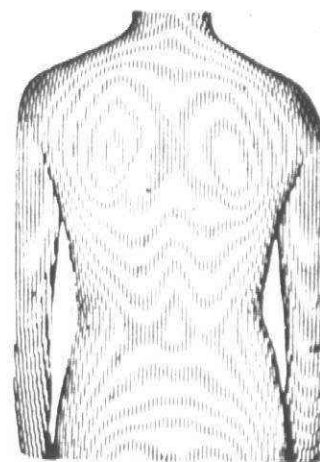



Conference focuses on communication

A special conference aimed at meeting the needs of students who encounter difficulty in learning was held recently for teachers of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Exceptionally Ours, for teachers in grades six through 12, also was designed to better the communication among professionals and parents.

The conference was developed by teachers and parents, and was supported by funding from the district's Model Resource Room Project.

This project is part of the special education program and has as its goal the development of a model for helping handicapped students succeed in the main stream of education.

As part of that goal, teachers must be able to voice their concerns and work together to help solve their students' learning problems.

The conference included a general session for all faculty and eight workshops focusing on selected aspects of the teaching process.

The general session, presented by Dr. Nora Martin of Eastern Michigan University, gave examples to help educators understand handicapped

students' learning difficulties.

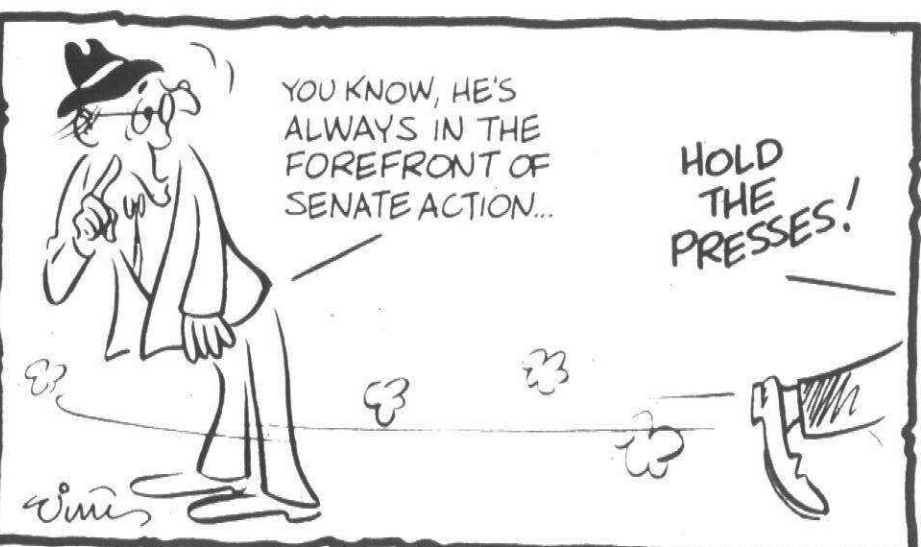
The workshop sessions included presentations by Lori Buchwach, from the University of Pittsburgh, on developing classroom materials and William Eary, of the Milwaukee public schools, on managing behavior.

Dr. Marilyn Lake and Dr. Gary Navarre, both from EMU, conducted workshops on gathering information about student needs and on communicating with parents.

Five high school special education students spoke about the difficulties they encounter in their schools. The students told about their problems and expressed their feelings about education.

Providing positive experiences for students was the subject of Carolyn Wassink's workshop, and tips for improving motivation were given by this consultant from Wayne County Intermediate School District.

Two additional workshops consisted of panels of teachers, administrators, and support staff, and emphasized the airing of concerns teachers have and ways to improve communication among educators.

Voorhies, Bowles both active in grand juries

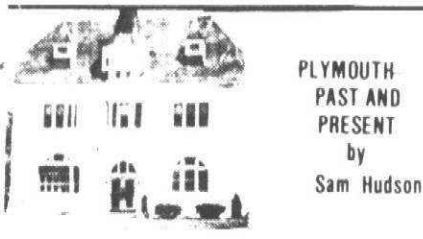
(Part II, continuing the careers of a noted Plymouthite of the past, Paul Voorhies, and of the present, George Bowles.)

Bowles studied English and Latin at Grove City College where he earned a BA degree in 1936. For two years he taught English and Latin at Falls Creek and Stoneboro, Penn. Then, like Voorhies, he studied law at University of Michigan where he earned his LLB degree in 1941.

Paul Voorhies was admitted to the bar in Michigan in 1900. His mother wanted him to become a big city lawyer so she gave him \$1,000 to set out his shingle in New York City. He was admitted to the New York bar in 1901.

After a year in New York, he ran out of money and returned to Plymouth where he opened a law office on Main Street, where the parking lot of the First Federal Savings and Loan Association is now located. In 1902, he married Fay Bodmer, of Ann Arbor. They had two children, both girls.

George Bowles wanted to be an expert in labor law. In 1941, after he



obtained his law degree, he took a job in a Milwaukee factory. That not only gave him insight into the worker's side of the labor management equation, it brought him closer to a girl he had met on a blind date—his future wife Catherine, who was then teaching at nearby Whitefish Bay.

Bowles became a field examiner with the National Labor Relations Board in 1942, covering Wisconsin and upper Michigan. Then, "because Michigan was the big league in labor relations," he took a job with the War Labor Board in Detroit, where he assisted Louis C. Miriani, later mayor of the city.

From 1943 to 1945, Bowles was director of the disputes division of the Detroit Regional War Labor Board, a position which gave him plenty of

practice in soothing hot tempers and guiding management and labor to satisfactory terms. In 1945, he returned to private practice as an arbitrator in the labor law field.

NEITHER VOORHIES nor Bowles specialized in criminal law. Yet, ironically, both found themselves in public offices which called for investigation of crime.

In private practice, Voorhies concentrated on real-estate law. Yet, from 1912 through 1924, he was charged with prosecuting those who broke the law in Wayne County. Bowles, whose specialty was mediation, soon found himself in a position where he was required to ferret out charges of false political campaign accounts, bribery to allow gambling and prostitution, and the drugging of horses at the Detroit Race Course.

Voorhies was assistant prosecuting attorney of Wayne County from 1912 to 1918, and prosecuting attorney from 1921 to 1924. He was especially zealous in cracking down on gambling and stock swindling schemes. In 1938, he was special prosecuting attorney for the Grand Jury that investigated the assassination of Jerry Buckley, the

radio commentator.

Buckley, who aired a program favoring the recall of Detroit Mayor Charles Bowles, on charges that he was lax in enforcing the law, was shot to death by three gunmen in the lobby of the LaSalle Hotel on Woodward Avenue. The murder took place on July 23, 1930, on the day the mayor was recalled. The investigation failed to establish a connection with the recall, and the case was never solved.

Both Voorhies and Bowles served the public at the county, as well as the state level. After Voorhies was county prosecutor, he ran on the Republican ticket for the office of Attorney General of Michigan. Elected on Nov. 30, 1930, he became the first and only Plymouthite to reach that office. He served as attorney general while Wilber M. Brucker was governor. Both were swept out of office, with other Republicans, during the Democratic landslide of 1932 which put Franklin Delano Roosevelt in the White House.

In addition to Bowles' work for the federal government on the National Labor Relations Board, he also served the public on the state level, as mediator, and at the county level as circuit

court judge and as One-man Grand Juror.

THE CAREERS OF both Voorhies and Bowles were strongly influenced by their association with other figures prominent on the Michigan scene.

Voorhies' law practice began to prosper when he was able to obtain Sebastian S. Kresge as a client. Kresge, probably the richest Methodist in Michigan at the time, met the young lawyer from Plymouth at one of the many Methodist church functions which Voorhies attended. Voorhies was soon handling the prosperous merchant's multitudinous legal affairs.

In 1924, Paul Voorhies became the first president and a trustee of the Kresge Foundation, a position he held until his death 28 years later. He also served, for 24 years, as a trustee of Albion College. This Methodist institution was one of the many colleges in the United States which benefited from grants from the Foundation.

Bowles' career was favorably influenced through his association with G. Mennen Williams. One of a group of idealistic young reformers in the Democratic party at the end of World War

II, Bowles was a strong supporter of Governor Williams, whose acute sensitivity to human needs appealed to him.

Recognizing Bowles' skill as a labor arbitrator, Williams asked him to represent him as a personal observer at auto industry negotiations. In 1951, Governor Williams named Bowles, who was then 35 to the Michigan Labor Mediation Board. Bowles was chairman of that board from 1951 to 1956, the year Williams appointed him to the Wayne County Circuit Court. He was elected to the office three times thereafter.

In January, 1976, after serving as judge for 19 years, and after being in public life for more than 30 years, Bowles decided to return to private practice. He wanted, his announcement said, "to spend more time with our children," and to devote time, in private practice, to "the development and use of speedy, inexpensive methods of dispute settlement outside the courtroom."

(Part II, concluding this series, will tell of Voorhies' celebrated women's rights case, and Bowles' experiences as Wayne County's One-man Grand Juror.)

A junior who is small by football standards (5-10, 155 pounds), Brennan had received a Catholic Central punt at the Brother Rice 39-yard line.

He hesitated one step to the right. Then he stuttered a few paces to the left.

Finally Brennan reversed his direction again. Around the right side of the field he raced behind a wall of Rice blockers before cutting upfield and finishing with a 61-yard touchdown run.

Following Brian Swanson's extra point kick, Brother Rice led 14-6. The second quarter punt return seemed to take an edge off Catholic Central's effort. Rice eventually won 21-6 with another Brennan touchdown.

Rice and Catholic Central had entered the annual Boys' Bowl game as the number one and three ranked Class A teams in Michigan respectively.

Last year Rice won a 9-6 victory over Central. Rice had rallied to score nine points in the final three minutes after Central had led 6-0 since the first quarter.

CENTRAL WAS AGAIN prepared for action in the first quarter. After receiving the opening kickoff, the Shamrocks drove 80 yards in 20 plays for a touchdown. The drive lasted 9:47. Every play was a running play.

Quarterback Tom Lewis capped the fine drive with a two-yard run. A bad snap from center, however, doomed the extra point kick to failure.

Brother Rice didn't wait till the fourth quarter to respond this time. The Warriors drove 64 yards in 13 plays on their first possession.

All-State quarterback Jon English completed six passes on the drive. English converted three third down plays, two passing and another running. He capped the drive with a five-yard option run off right tackle, waltzing untouched into Central's end zone.

English finished the day with a perfect nine of nine passing for 75 yards, despite heavy winds.

"The key to the game today," said Rice coach Al Fracassa, "was how we came back and scored seven points after they scored six."

Brennan followed that key drive with his punt return. It was his second

punt return for a touchdown. Brennan ran a 69-yard return against Bishop Borgess two weeks ago. His only other punt return this season was 20 yards, giving him a 50-yard punt return average.

"I THINK THE KEY to the game was the punt return," said Central coach Tom Mach. "It was something we earned by good blocking, but we can't give up a touchdown like that without making them work harder."

"They (Rice) gained back the momentum after their first touchdown," Mach said, "and increased the momentum by scoring very fast afterwards on the punt return."

Brennan added another touchdown run (three yards) in the third quarter. Brian Swanson kicked his third straight extra point of the game.

In addition to his scoring plays, Brennan was the second-leading rusher with 33 yards and the second-leading tackler with eight tackles.

Rice had 64 yards rushing for 139 yards total offense. Central countered with a net of 90 yards rushing and 24 passing for 114 yards.

"They're (Rice) offense continually frustrated our defense," Mach said, "coming up with the big play when they needed it. We had (hit) English a couple times and he still completed passes. That started a process of them (Central) wondering what the heck they would have to do to stop it (Rice's offense)."

Central's offense also looked potent in the early going led by Randy Larson.

"THAT LARSON is a very good back," said Rice defensive coach Ron Kalczynski. "We were keying on him. We didn't make any adjustment after that first drive. On that first drive we gave them first and five twice and a first down once with offside penalties."

Rice finished the game with eight penalties for 55 yards. Central was penalized twice for 20 yards.

Neither team lost a fumble or interception.

Eddie Lynch led Rice's defense with nine tackles. Steve Kaiser had seven, while Mike Cooney and Steve Chiodo each had six.

Both teams continue league play this week. Rice travels to the University of Detroit 2:30 p.m. Saturday, while Catholic Central plays Notre Dame at Clarenceville High School.

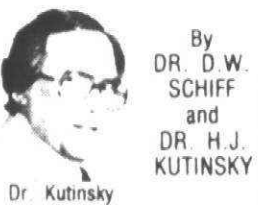

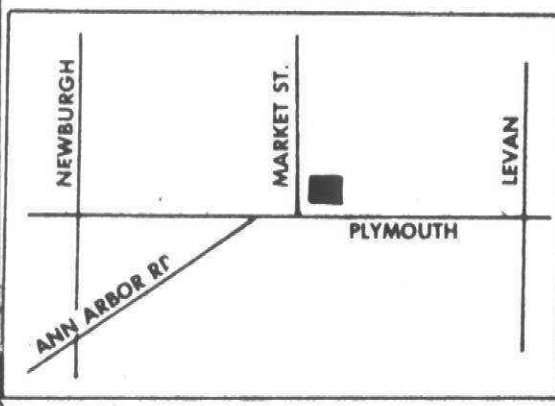

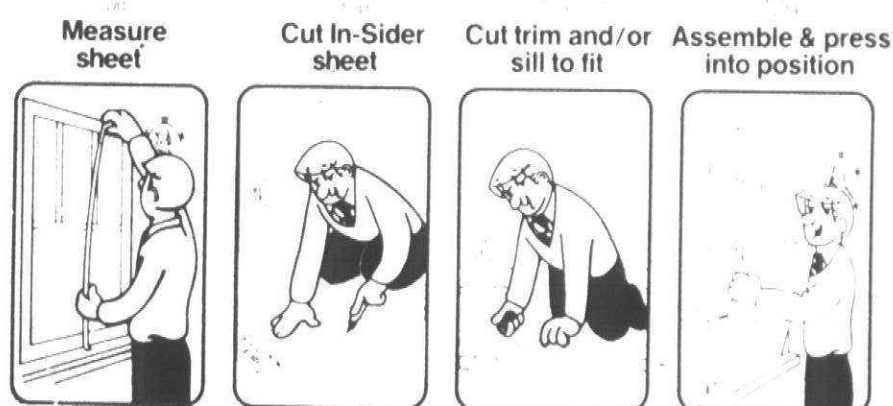

Investigation is fiasco

Canton Township is embroiled in a version of "I've Got a Secret" in which Supervisor Harold Stein is the master of ceremonies, the Canton building department is the mystery guest and everyone else in the township serves as a puzzled panelist.

Games played on television, not in our township government.

Stein has asked the Michigan State Police to investigate the building department. No one but Stein seems to know why an investigation should be conducted. Is it mass corruption? Bribes and kickbacks? Poker games at lunchtime?

Any charges involved seem left to the whims of

imagination. What crime has been committed or who committed it has not been revealed.

If there is indeed some serious problem in the building department, Stein is quite correct to ask that it be investigated. Unfortunately, the manner in which he has chosen to conduct this investigation has done more harm than good.

STEIN, OF ALL people, should realize that one should not make serious charges (or imply them) against another party without good cause.

He has been the victim of charges and nasty innuendos himself. He considers many of these charges to be nothing more than the inventions of those campaigning against him.

Surely Stein must be aware how his undefined problem with the building department appears in the eyes of the citizens.

Implying charges without actually making any has the smell of politicking.

If Stein does indeed worry about the possibility of jeopardizing a case against the building department by revealing further information, one must ask why he even announced that an investigation was going to take place.

If there are corrupt actions going on, this advance warning has provided ample time for the culprits to cover their tracks. Investigations tend to be more successful if the suspect doesn't know they're going on.

What becomes even more curious in this scenario is that no one on the township board seems to know what the investigation is about. The trustees are supposed to know what's going on in Canton, but board members claim they don't have any more information than anyone else.

Stein says he told them his reasons for requesting the probe. Obviously, someone is lying.

IT'S BEGINNING to look as though an investigation will never be conducted, although the reason the entire thing is being called off is every bit as mysterious as the reason it was instigated.

Many questions remain unanswered.

Is there really some kind of corruption in the building department?

Was Stein making a grandstand play in order to get votes for his write-in campaign?

Are board members really uninformed about the problem?

Maybe we'll all find out when Hollywood comes out with the movie. The working title is "Mystery of the Canton Triangle."

provision into a new constitution. The whole package will be voted down, and months of work by a con-con will surely be wasted.

THE "TIMES" are also wrong for a new con-con.

In the early 1960s, con-con was pushed chiefly by the League of Women Voters, Citizens for Michigan and the Jaycees—three impartial and non-partisan groups with no axes to grind, no special interests to serve.

The 1970s, however, have seen the emergence of fragmented single-issue politics. For proof, just consider the other 10 issues on the ballot and other issues that failed to get on the ballot.

Many such groups are at war with each other, as over the abortion question. Some have religious causes, as with state funding of church-related schools.

Some have taxation plots, as with rural schools which want a share of taxes on city factories but don't want to share taxes on farms.

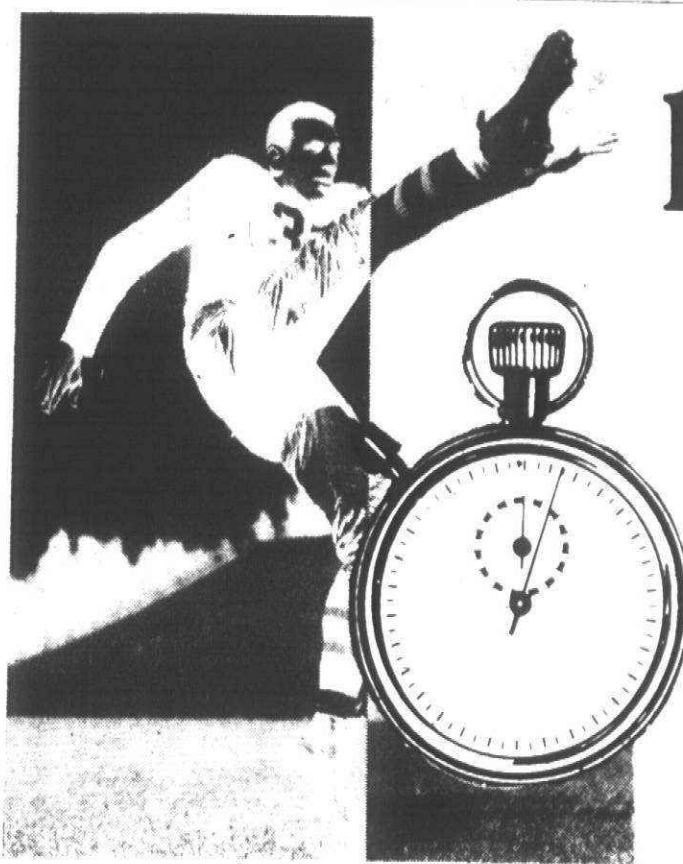
Some have wild or repressive ideas on how to deal with crime. And some see themselves losing legislative power after the 1980 census and want to grab all they can now by re-rigging the state constitution.

ANY CONSTITUTION must acquire what lawyers call "legal maturity"—that is, much experience and many court decisions before its meanings are pinned down. The present constitution, after 15 years, is just acquiring such maturity.

Moreover, it is a very good constitution—not super-excellent, but not mediocre. It would be extremely risky to rewrite it in 1979. Proposal A deserves a NO vote.

the story of what each has done in behalf of civic and cultural organizations.

To that, one must add Ernie's deep interest in music and John's in athletics. In the instance of Jones, he is so widely recognized as a talented conductor that he has directed groups in Carnegie Hall and London's Royal College of Music, to say nothing of such sites as Ann Arbor's Hill Auditorium and Plymouth's Kellogg Park.

Football fans remember Pingel as one of the greatest triple threat halfbacks of the '30s. He was the Detroit Lions' No. 1 draft choice in 1939 and was the leading NFL punter in his one and only pro season.

Then came World War II and five years in the Army. When John was discharged it was with the rank of lieutenant colonel. His decorations included the Bronze Star and Purple Heart. So much for biographies.

WHILE JONES WAS selling ads for the student paper, the Michigan Daily, I was there writing sports. Pingel and I got to know one another in the same span as fraternity brothers. Sure we'll be there Saturday, along with about 105,000 others, when U-M and MSU clash for the 71st time since 1898.

In John's years, State beat the Big Blue 21-7 in '36, then the aforementioned 19-14 in '37, before losing in '38, 14-0. This game marked the Michigan debuts of coach Fritz Crisler and halfback Tom Harmon.

For kicks, I revisited the Daily office last week to look at the stories of those games. It's an odd sensation to see your byline of more than four decades past. Better than that were the other bylines which leaped from the pages. Jones remembers them as colleagues. Pingel won't find them strangers either.

Weigh just these three: the late Irvin (Pete) Lisagor, who later in life would become Washington bureau chief for the Chicago Daily News and recognized as one of the foremost journalists of his era; Burton (Bud) Benjamin, now executive producer of the Walter Cronkite evening TV news show on CBS, and that highly successful Birmingham attorney, Frederick G. Buesser, who went on to become president of the State Bar of Michigan. Yes, we had one hell of a staff.

Within recent days, Pingel, Jones and I reminisced. Our memories seemed more important than whatever happens at Ann Arbor in 1978. When those two talk about each other, it's one of a kind talking about one of a kind.

Ernie Jones and John Pingel are two of the giants in today's advertising world. Yet it is unlikely that many of the 71,800 persons who heard one and saw the other in Michigan Stadium 41 years ago Saturday had sufficient foresight to know such status would come to pass.

The last three words of that paragraph are particularly apt in reference to Pingel, for if anyone had "come to pass" that October afternoon in 1937 it was John, then a junior at Michigan State University under coach Charley Bachman.

Before the day was over, this budding All-American halfback from Mt. Clemens had passed 20 and 40 yards for the touchdowns which led the Spartans to a 19-14 victory over the Wolverines. It was the fourth year in a row State had triumphed and the last such occasion until 1950.

True, the dashing John Spencer Pingel was the hero on the field. But there had to be more than a few in the crowd with an appreciation for the fanfare and color that accompany college football. At Ann Arbor, part of the tradition is that stirring command which comes booming over the public address system about 20 minutes before every opening kickoff: "Bazand... Take the field!"

Now you'll guess it. The "voice" of Michigan's band that fall of '37 was a senior from Jamestown, N.Y., a music nut who also was business manager of the Michigan Daily, Ernest Albin Jones.

JONES IS NOW international chairman of an advertising agency based in Bloomfield Hills, D'Arcy-MacManus & Masius, Inc. It is one of the world's 10 largest.

Ever the salesman, Ernie lists 17 countries on four continents as his personal territory even though he lives only moments from headquarters.

When I talked with him last week, he was just back from a speaking engagement in Johannesburg, South Africa. He has spent his entire professional career in advertising.

Pingel has been president of Ross Roy, Inc. since 1964. This is another of the titans among advertising agencies and its principal offices are on E. Jefferson in Detroit. The Pingels live in Grosse Pointe Woods.

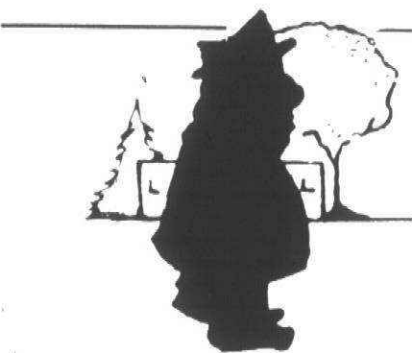

date to call on as many voters as he could (this was before women were given the right to vote) and treat them, either by passing out cigars or by buying a drink for the house in the various saloons along the way. There never was a mention of the voters building up a fund for their favored candidate.

One favorite gathering place was the small town fire hall. Here the volunteer firemen gathered in the evening. The hall was like a club room in that it boasted a card room and a pool table. Many an evening one had to stand in line to get at the card tables or to get a chance to pocket the eight ball in the side pocket.

COME ELECTION time, they would invite the candidates down for an evening and put on what could be called a rally. Unlike the fundraisers of today, these rallies didn't cost the firemen anything, even though they always had a fresh keg of beer on tap.

In each hall was a list of all the saloons in town. This was an open invitation to go down to the brewery and get a keg of beer and charge it to him. They never spoke out loud, but

there was an underlying threat that if he didn't supply the keg of beer, it would be too bad if his place ever caught on fire.

It so happened in our little town in the foothills of the mountains of Pennsylvania, the brewery was only about three blocks from the fire hall. And there always was a wheelbarrow handy. The firemen would pull straws to see who would be saddled with the task of getting the beer.

You can imagine what an evening of this sort was like. The candidate met a lot of people. The firemen had a nice evening—all they wanted to drink and it didn't cost a cent. There never was a bit of raising money. But they were good vote-getters if the candidate made a favorable impression.

ON OTHER occasions, candidates would visit the saloons in town, and if there were not too many standing at the bar, they would buy a drink for the house. The candidate always made sure he bought the drink before the place filled up. This was a political trick because the candidate would be introduced as a "great fellow" when the rest of the evening customers gathered.

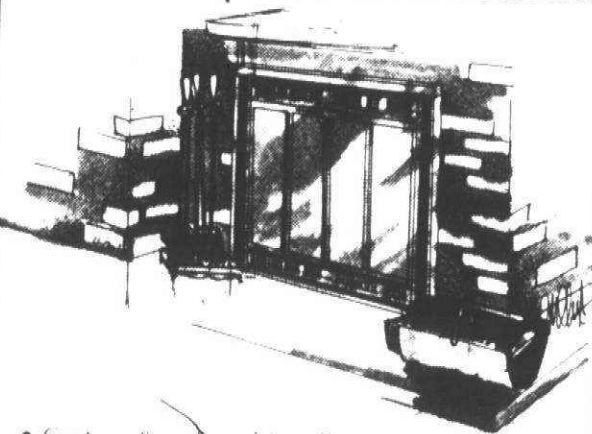
cedures are among subjects to be included.

A pianist with the Farmington Musicale who has taught French for five years and works as an artists' agent

They take their hearts to retarded

One girl was lying face down on the floor. A teenage boy was bellowing and thrusting his legs and arms in all directions. A youngster sitting yoga style was staring blankly into space. A young man with face and limbs twisted rolled up in a wheelchair.

It was the visitor's first time in one of the residence halls of the Plymouth Center for Human Development. She wondered if she would be able to handle her introduction to so many human tragedies caused by mental and physical retardation.

She was shocked to hear a voice at her elbow.

"This is one of the good halls," said Mrs. Faye Sills of Farmington, who wanted the visitor to face up to the realities of the center. There were much more difficult problems in other halls, she said.

Mrs. Sills is there for the reason that has brought to the center for 17 years, and a year before that to an institution for the retarded at Nine Mile near Grand River in Farmington.

With her husband, Philip, she is visiting the residents, some of whom she has known all their lives. That day the two of them brought in supplies for a meal for about 15 residents.

THEY OFTEN SPEND Sunday this way. And a couple times during the week, they usually bring clothes and try to help the residents.

They often escort a group of their retarded friends out to dinner. The

Sills celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary with more than 30 of them at Huck's Bavarian Village in Redford Township. Mrs. Sills' 70th birthday will be the cause for a similar outing.

"I love the children," she said. "They are loveable and sweet, my whole life. If I can't do this work, then my life is not worth anything."

The conversation was interrupted because Mrs. Sills was on the move. She decided something must be done for the teenager who was still flinging his arms and legs, accompanied by hoarse cries.

She closed in on him, even though it meant catching several blows from his flying limbs. With her arms at last around him, his activity ceased.

He rested his head on her shoulder, listening to her soothing words instead of making noises himself.

In a few minutes other residents bid for her attention. She introduced the visitor to her friends. Physical contact changed everything for the newcomers, and the first step was taken toward transforming these "cases" into people.

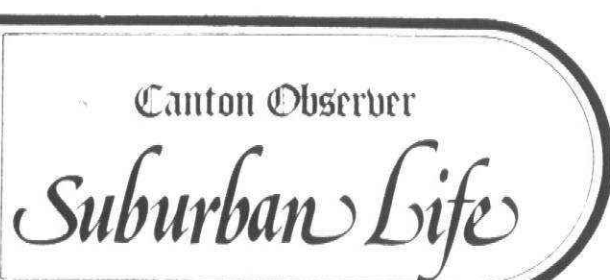
They like holding hands and do so for several minutes. One even kisses her hand.

In another room, the Sills introduce their friend to a young man in a wheelchair. His face is twisted to one side and his arms have a life of their own. He can't talk, but he wants to communicate.

Across his lap is a board fastened to his wheelchair. A series of sentences are printed on the board. Over to one

side are the letters of the alphabet.

Struggling to master his hand, he brings his finger down on a sentence which says something like, "It's nice to have you here."

THE VISITOR REPENDS by pointing to the sentence, "Thank you." He wants to know why she is here, as explained through the words on his lap. He leans back and smiles. He has communicated.

A young woman in a wheelchair is a special friend of the Sills. She lived with them for a time, with Philip carrying her about.

"Phil had a heart attack, and couldn't carry her around any more," she said, so their friend now makes her home in the center. "If she had had therapy every day, she could walk," Mrs. Sills added. "She's not the only one. There are not enough people here to give them that individual care."

The Sills' separate to collect the friends who are coming to dinner in a small dining room of a residence hall. Philip takes the visitor to Sullivan Hall, where he will pick up four blind

women to take to the party.

When he calls out to them in the day room, they jump up, happy to follow him.

THEY FORM A LINE, and holding onto the shoulder of the one in front they make their way down the corridor and out the door.

Once outside, Sills guides them until he finds they are leaning on him too heavily. The visitor helps them toward the dining room. On the way, she is asked her birthdate by one of the blind women.

Sills said the woman can tell a person the day of his next birthday. Saturday is the day she mentions. Later the visitor looks it up, and she's right.

Soon a supper group is formed of individuals from various residence halls. For a while they gossip and exchange news with each other, a reminder that like everyone else, they take pleasure in old friends.

Mrs. Sills stopped to recall the earlier days of some of the children.

"Willie was my first baby," she said, referring to a teenager with a muscular body but foreshortened legs.

"He had such brittle bones he had to be carried on a pillow. At a year and a half he talked. He remembers everything, but he doesn't know what one and one add up to."

Some of the residents are not retarded, she said. "But once they are put in a home like this and stay for years, they get like that. It's the fault of the parents who put them in."

Mrs. Sills and her husband believe they should focus their attention on a large number of residents instead of cultivating one or two favorites.

Once she became devoted to a particular boy. "When he died it almost killed me," she said. "Phil told me

that I couldn't allow that to happen again."

The Sills use a combination of their own funds plus outside donations to finance the restaurant visits.

"This is not easy work," but once you get into it, you can't stop," she smiled. "We have to do what we can while we can. We're getting older."

Mrs. Sills, who lost her vision in one eye and has difficulty with the other, regards herself as a lobbyist for all the retarded in the building. Currently her dream is for a bus for the wheelchair residents.

"Sometimes we find we can't fight city hall, so we go around them," she laughed.

Mill rebuilt

It's cider season at Parmenter's

The cider is flowing freely out at Parmenter's Northville Cider Mill, west of I-275 off Eight Mile. It is rumored that 1978 is a very good year for the golden liquid made from an blend of apples trucked in from Benton Harbor and Grand Rapids areas.

Vern and Ruth Bodker have been in charge of the place for the past 12 years. The former Redford Township residents now make their home in Brighton.

They give the months of September, October and November to creating their own vintage and selling it, along with plain and apple spice donuts, caramel apples, candy, apples, rock candy and popcorn balls.

They are happy to be back in business this fall. Fire burned the mill to the ground last year, and it had to be

completely rebuilt. The Bodkers and their employees have been busy establishing new routines for the cement block structure covered on the outside by board and batten. Painted red, it looks like a New England barn.

Inside are pine picnic tables for those who want to sit down and quaff cider and munch donuts. A glass will set you back 25 cents, a freshly-baked donut, 17 cents.

CIDER ALSO flows out of door in gallon, half-gallon and quart containers. The price for a gallon is \$2.40, for a half-gallon it's \$1.50, for a quart 95 cents. Donuts are \$1.75 a dozen.

"Business is good since the weather changed," reported Mrs. Bodker, who usually can be found standing behind the counter. "People don't seem to know it's fall and cider time until it

gets cool."

She is busy mornings taking care of busloads and carloads of children who arrive at intervals. First they watch through a doorway as Bodker explains how the apples are first dumped into a washer where their round, red bodies are given the scrubbing of their life by 12 nylon brushes and eight high pressure jets of water.

Then it's on to the hammermill for the apples where they are squeezed by a screw-type press. The juice is put into stainless steel containers.

"The secret to good cider," said Bodker, "is good apples, good blend and keeping it clean and cold."

As for the pulp, some of it is picked up by individuals to take north to feed to ducks. Some farmers use it for hog feed.

"It's not too good for fertilizer because it has too much acid," explained the cider maker.

ONCE THE CIDER production line is examined, visiting children enter the mill to taste the end product. About five to six groups of children come each day.

"Ten per cent of our business comes during the week," pointed out Bodker. "Another 10 per cent comes on Saturday and 80 per cent on Sunday."

Former owner of Bodker's Dairy Co. in Redford, Bodker said he purchased the business from the Parmenters to keep himself out of trouble during his retirement years. But you could hardly call it retirement. He also runs a Ford tractor and farm implement dealership in Alpena.

Mrs. Bodker, who was a little reluctant to get involved in the hurly-burly of the cider and donut world, has found she enjoys the hectic life. "It is quite challenging," she said.

While her husband sees to the cider production, she orders cups, napkins and the various products sold along with the cider and donuts. Three full-time employees work on the cider and four full-timers make donuts and sell the merchandise.

Many high school students work at the mill. From 20-25 work each season at the facility which is opened from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily.

Other items of interest at the mill are the ducks on the branch of the Rouge River that runs through the property and the railroad tracks laid through the valley in which it is located.

"Kids from the city run out to see the trains go by," said Mrs. Bodker.

3-year-olds can get a head start

The PLUS preschool is looking for three-year-olds to take part in a new Head Start program.

"Activities for the family will be included in this new program," said Mary Fritz, Head Start director.

The Head Start program is a joint project of the Plymouth-Canton Schools and the federal government. Children from the district whose families meet income criteria set up by the government are eligible for participation.

The three-year-olds will be assessed to determine their stage of learning level, according to Mrs. Fritz. A beginning learning program will be developed for each child. The program will be carried out by a specially trained home visitor who will visit mothers and children on a weekly basis.

Simple early learning skills will be taught by the home visitor and the mother.

A learning kit featuring materials found in the home will be left for parent and child to work with the rest of the week.

FOUR-YEAR-OLDS who meet Head Start guidelines also will be eligible for home visits or the PLUS school-based program.

New evidence based on studies begun in the '60s show that early childhood intervention programs such as Head Start can raise IQ scores significantly. Vocabulary, math skills and general knowledge also can be increased. These studies, according to Bernard Brown of the United States Office of Health, Education and Welfare, show gains for not months, but years.

Families with three and four-year-olds will be eligible for the program if: You live in the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools District. Your child will be three or four years of age by Dec. 1, 1978; You can verify your income status; He or she is a foster child; or he or she can qualify in a handicapped category.

Those who feel they can qualify for this program can call 453-8889 for more information.

Sessions for three and four-year-olds are held two days a week. There is a one-day session for three-year-olds on Wednesday mornings.

The school is licensed by the state and has been operating since 1962. A \$5 deposit is required at the time of registration. Parents are expected to assist at the school approximately 12 times a year for the two-day session.

CANTON Seniors enjoyed a two-day trip to Amish Acres and Notre Dame last week. Some 46 senior citizens left the Canton Recreation Hall Oct. 3 and traveled through the rich farm belt of southern Michigan before turning southward to the Amish Acres near the town of Nappanee, Ind.

Upon arrival, the seniors' lunch was no ordinary lunch. It was an Amish feast. The five-course meal was home-cooked on the premises by the Amish and took one hour and 15 minutes to consume.

After the feast, the seniors had a guided tour of the house and farm. The historic 12-room house is completely furnished in detail as it has been since 1876 with no modernization. The Amish people's religious beliefs dictate that they live without such modern innovations as electricity, cars, or self-powered farm machinery. Everything is done by hand or with horse-drawn implements and carriages. Even the clothing and dress are similar to that of 17th century Europe. There are

2,000 Old Order Amish living in this area, still carrying on the traditions of their forefathers.

THE SENIORS thoroughly enjoyed the tour and seeing various craftsmen at work in their respective trades.

The next day found the seniors at University of Notre Dame, home of the Fighting Irish. They took a tour of the 1,500-acre campus which was founded in 1842. Among the sights they enjoyed was the Administration Building with its magnificent golden dome surmounted by a statue of the Virgin Mary and containing a mural depicting the life of Christopher Columbus. They viewed the Grotto of Lourdes which is a beautiful reproduction of the original in France.

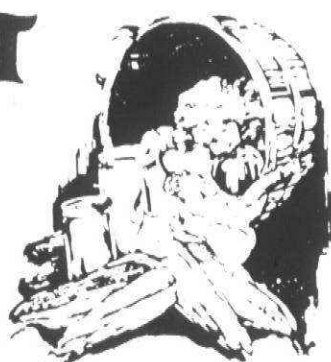

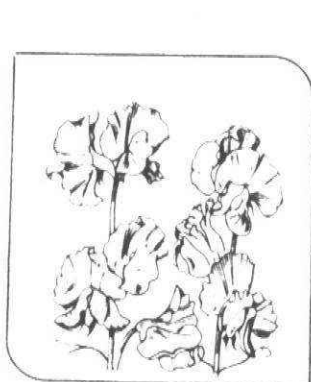

an appetizer of gourmet quality was served up by the Oakway Symphony Orchestra Saturday evening in its season-opening cabaret concert.

And it served its purpose well. It left me eager to hear the music that conductor Francesco DiBlasi will produce for the main course.

The first opportunity will come Sunday, Nov. 19, at 4 p.m. in Mercy High School, Middlebelt and Eleven Mile, when the symphony will have as guest soloist pianist Ilse von Alphenheim (Mrs. Antal Dorati).

This is the first of the regular six-concert series.

Saturday night's concert, in the Madonna College Activities Building, was a well-attended, informal foretaste of things to come. In it, I was most impressed with the strength and sureness of DiBlasi's conducting, the excellent job he has done of welding together a disciplined small orchestra, yet one that plays with enthusiasm.

ANOTHER HIGH spot of the evening was the presentation of two arias by Rosemary Jackson, a former resident of Livonia, who has unfortunately moved to Missouri. Suffice it to say that her "Musetta's Waltz" from "La Boheme" had a sparkle that my recording, by another soprano, lacks.

Fat Bob Taylor displayed his versatility in "Di Provenza il Mar" from "La Traviata," a piece he described as a scene taken straight out of "Love of Life."

The orchestra and Sonny Eliot were delightful in "Peter and the Com-misser," a spoof by Allen Sherman of "Peter and the Wolf." The music in this is really great, featuring such things as Verdi's triumphal march from "Aida" in Dixieland style, Brahms' "Lullaby" as a rock and roll piece, and "Swan Lake" in a blues mood.

Gem and mineral show shines to Sunday

The Greater Detroit Gem and Mineral Show will be held Friday, Oct. 13 6-10 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 14 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Sunday, Oct. 15 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Held at the Detroit Light Guard Armory, East Eight Mile and Ryan, this show of the earth's exotic minerals, gems and fossils is being given for the 15th year by the Michigan Mineralogical Society, a non-profit educational organization which meets monthly at Cranbrook Institute of Science.

Included will be precious gems, sparkling minerals, hand-crafted mineral sculpture and jewelry from near and remote regions of the world.

Famous museum, university and private collectors have collaborated to gather together for this short term exhibit of heavenly, earthly and man-crafted masterpieces.

Examples are outer space meteorites which will be shown jointly by Wayne State University and Cranbrook Institute of Science to the show's feature attraction, an exquisite tiara given by Napoleon Bonaparte to his second wife, Maria Louise, upon the birth of a son in 1811.

THIS MARIA LOUISE high-symmetry diadem is being brought for display by the Smithsonian Institution. The crown is comprised of 950 Indian dia-

monds, total weight 700 carats, set off by 79 cabachons of high quality Persian turquoise, weighing 540 carats.

This valuable historical object, wrought in silver with excellent workmanship, was willed by Maria Louise to the Archduke Leopold of Austria, to become the property of the Imperial Family of Austria. Later it was acquired by Mrs. Marjorie Post who donated it to the Smithsonian. Accompanying papers indicate only that emeralds which were originally in the crown were replaced by the beautiful turquoise "a few years ago."

From relatively close locations Cranbrook Institute of Science's two

cases of mineral specimens will present "Minerals of Michigan and Wisconsin Iron Ranges and from South-eastern Michigan and Northwestern Ohio."

A program of talks during the show will feature speakers such as Pete Dunn from the Smithsonian presenting "Highlights of the U.S. National Gem Collection" and a return visit of Dr. Dwayne Stone, Marietta College, speaking on "Dinosaurs I Have Dug."

Special working demonstrations of techniques for tumbling gem stones, faceting, carving in mineral or rock, sphere making and polishing, cabachon making and micromounting will be featured.

Jose Greco: Warming up to Dracula

By ETHEL SIMMONS

Jose Greco, whom everyone knows as a Spanish dancer, will be swirling his cape as Count Dracula in a dramatic production coming to the Birmingham Theatre.

Greco was interviewed by phone from his hotel in New York.

Greco said the producer of "The Passion of Dracula" remembered how he performed as a dancer and decided to cast him in the lead role as the bloodthirsty count.

The "severe, arrogant stance that I seem to convey when I dance" was what apparently landed Greco on his feet as Dracula.

Greco does not dance in the part, but he does "swirling with the cape. The character changes into any sort of

beast or animal."

The cape is a symbol, and in an instant he can become a bat.

Arriving in Birmingham on Nov. 6 for performances through Nov. 18, Greco last performed in the Detroit area with his large dance company four or five years ago.

This is the eighth week of the road tour for "The Passion of Dracula" starring Greco. "I was supposed to do the New York engagement," he said, "but I was occupied."

Contrasting his portrayal of Dracula to Bela Lugosi's in the movies, Greco explained his own version "is a little more human."

He added, "He's a longing sinister man who can only exist by drinking

human blood. He isn't everyone's cup of tea."

But actually Dracula is just looking for a mate, like everybody else. "The Passion of Dracula" follows the idea of the film in which Lugosi appeared, Greco said.

If it seems like there's been a lot written and staged about Dracula, it's because there are four different productions adapted from the original Bram Stoker novel.

These plays are "Dracula," "The Passion of Dracula," "Prince of Darkness" and "Count Dracula," according to Greco.

THE APPEAL of the Dracula story, according to Greco, is "the bizarre, fantastic things that all of us have."

The drama has hidden sexual tones, he said.

"At one point she (the female lead) is convinced she is in love with me. I ask her to cut my chest open and drink blood. She does."

Does this make the show suitable for the kiddies?

Greco hastened to explain, "There's no direct suggestion of eroticism. The kids probably enjoy the show the most because the tricks are fantastic. I disappear, become a bat and fly into the audience. When the cross is touched, it explodes in my hand."

He has done dramatic roles in movies ("Ship of Fools"), but his is his first stage play. Greco's dance company will begin its regular tour in February.

Michigan poet to read works

Award-winning poet Robert Hayden will give a free public reading of his poetry on Saturday afternoon, Oct. 14, at 2 p.m. in Friends Auditorium at the main Detroit Public Library, 5201 Woodward.

Included in Hayden's program will be the premiere reading of his new work, "John Brown." The poetry reading will be followed by an informal reception in the library's Adam Strohm Hall, marking the opening of the new exhibit, "John Brown: His Influence on Literature and Music."

Hayden, a native Detroit, was educated at Wayne State University and the University of Michigan. In 1969 after 20 years on the faculty of Fisk University in Nashville, he came to teach at the University of Michigan. His 1970 book, "Words in The Mourning Time," was a National Book Award nominee.

Dr. Hayden is newly returned to Michigan after a year as poetry consultant for the Library of Con-

gress, a post equivalent to the British poet laureate, the first black to be so honored.

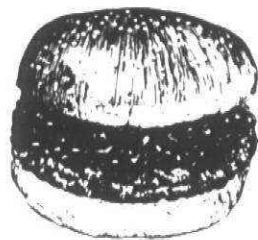

Cole Porter comes to life in Black Sheep production

"An Evening With Cole Porter" presented by The Black Sheep Repertory Theatre Touring Company is a two-act capsule of recent American history set to music.

Only it's much more entertaining than any classroom lecture on America's past.

Members of the touring company from Manchester were the featured performers last Saturday at the Sunday Dinner Theatre in the Mayflower Meeting House, Ann Arbor Trail and Main in Plymouth.

The group will be back Oct. 15 and 29, so there's still an opportunity to make reservations (453-1620) to enjoy a rousing rendition of the music of Cole Porter—the man for all ages.

THAT QUALITY of Porter was most evident in the Meeting House, watching the various audience reactions to one of America's most prolific composers.

The younger members of the audience, who maybe hadn't heard some of Porter's selections before, reacted with hearty laughter to the writer's humorous side—"Always

True to You in My Fashion," "C'est Magnifique," "Well, Did You Evah?," "Where is the Life That Late I Led," "Let's Do It," "Be A Clown," "Brush Up Your Shakespeare," "I Hate Men," etc.

The older folks, raised on Cole Porter, smiled or chuckled, or maybe even laughed—but not the outbursts of laughter from the younger set.

The genius of Porter, in part, was his ability to bring tears to the eyes from his rollicking humor, or bring tears to the eyes from his touching love songs. When it came to the latter, age made no difference. Eyes of all ages moistened to "Wunderbar," "Begin the Beguine," "Love for Sale," "Night and Day" and "I've Got You Under My Skin."

The excellence of the Black Sheep Repertory group of singers-dramatists lay in their ability to bring out Porter's double-sword.

Good singers? Yes. But more importantly, good actors who could bring

across to the audience the many moods of Cole Porter.

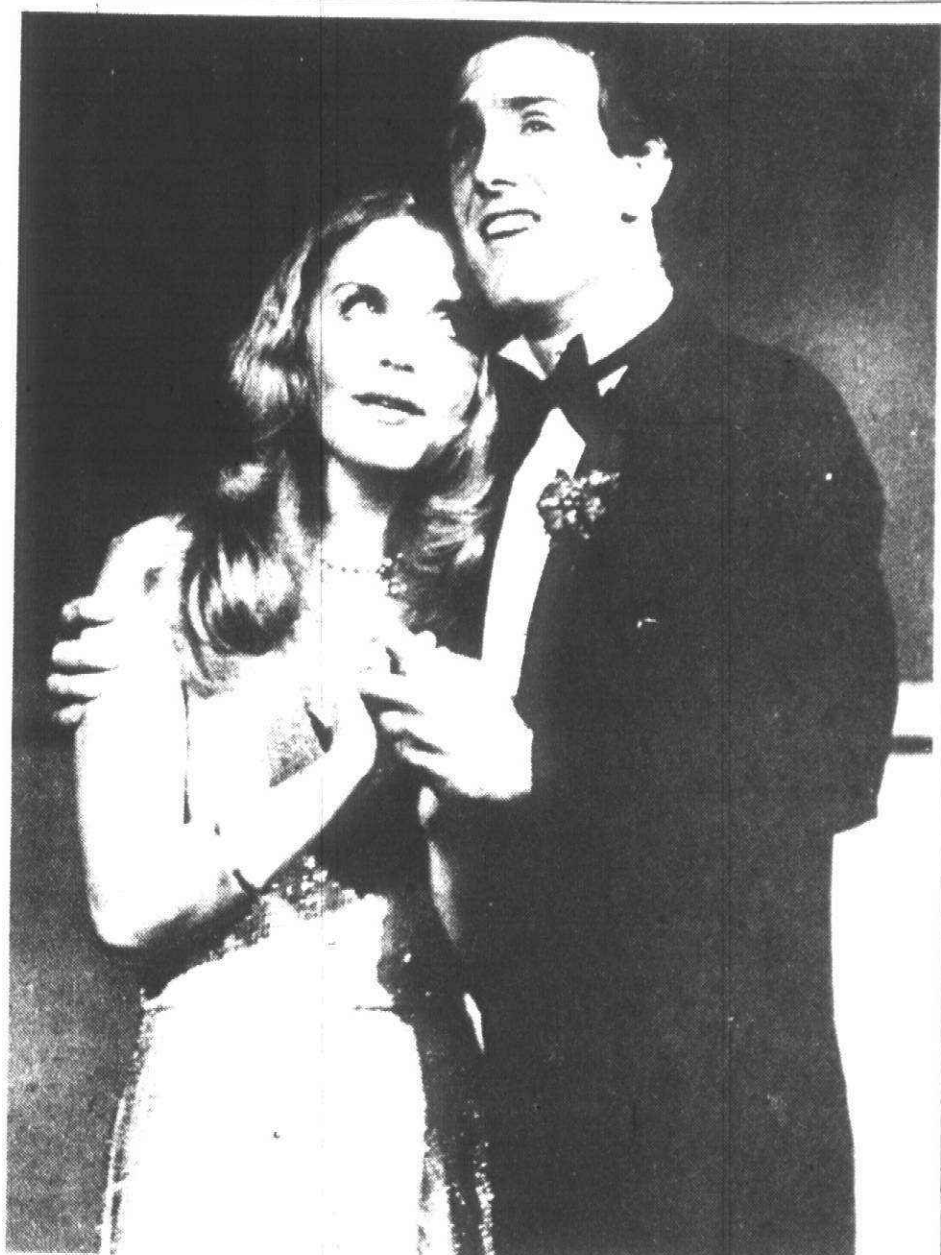
The dramatic skill of portraying the moods Porter captured in his music was especially executed in "Love for Sale," "Be A Clown," "Wunderbar," and "I Get A Kick Out of You."

BOTH ACTS COMBINED represented a panorama view of America in the 1930s and '40s. And his songs have had an impact on the thoughts many, especially his contemporaries, have about love, sex, and life.

I've often thought if a 51st star is ever added to Ole Glory, it ought to be reserved for Cole Porter—a state of mind.

I've also often been struck with the observation that Cole Porter is one of the few people who can wink at the deity and have God wink back, especially in such numbers as "Heaven Hop" and "Blow Gabriel, Blow."

And added to the entertainment was the fine food the Mayflower is known for—Cheese bar, house salad, roast beef or scrod, Indian corn custard, and Dutch apple pie with cocktails before and after dinner.

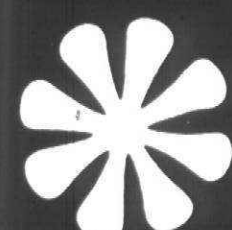

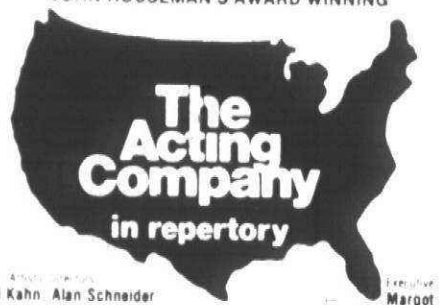

Grace Moravian to hear rare story of forgiveness

The murder and rape of her daughter will be the subject of a talk by Goldie Bristol at 7:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 13 in Grace Moravian Church, 31133 Hively, Westland.

Mrs. Bristol will also tell how the family learned to cope with Diane's death, and how she and her husband were able to forgive the murderer. She has discussed the event in a book called "These Tears are for Diane."

Diane was killed when she was out one night selling encyclopedias. The murderer was caught and convicted. Three years later the Bristols started a correspondence with him at the prison to which he had been sent.

They even set up a plan to meet him. "My heart raced like crazy," said Mrs. Bristol in a recent talk in Covenant Baptist Church, West Bloomfield. "He entered the room, we stood up, and he opened his arms to us."

While many misconstrued the action of the Bristols, one even writing that their forgiveness of the murderer meant they had little love for their daughter, the Bristols viewed their action differently.

"In no way have we ever condoned his actions," declared Mrs. Bristol. "We are against violence. Our forgiveness is very personal. It has nothing to do with the legal system."

In the opinion of the Bristols, the fact that they forgave the killer does not mean they are betraying their daughter.

"The pain is very real, and the loss

is very real," she explained. "But if we can be the vehicle where a precious soul can be retrieved, it gives meaning to our daughter's death."

The murderer, who is serving two life sentences to run consecutively, has become a tour guide in the prison, and attends Sunday chapel services and Monday Bible readings.

"We have high hopes that Mike will receive Christ as his Savior," stated Mrs. Bristol.

She explained that "once we got to the place where we could think clearly, we did not struggle with bitterness." She added: "God, for His reasons, placed in our hearts a spirit of forgiveness. There is no hatred or hostility in our hearts for our daughter's killer."

"We can allow the things that come into our lives that are not good to be the very means for providing growth."

Mrs. Bristol's book, now in its third printing, gives a brief description of the tragedy and an account of "what God has been showing us through the tragedy."

Royalties from the book have been contributed to the Prison Mission Association and Followup Ministries, Inc., which works with prisoners on parole. She has also donated money to various Christian colleges and to the Dearborn Bible Church.

Salem cagers bomb Bentley, 58-36

Canton drubs rival Mott

What was supposed to be a hard-nosed, breath-taking girls basketball game turned into nothing more than a romp for Plymouth Salem, as the Rocks rolled past Livonia Bentley 58-36 in the Salem gym Tuesday night.

The victory not only gave Salem an 8-0 overall record, tops in Observerland, but it also gave the undefeated squad the upperhand over Bentley in the Suburban Eight League race.

Bentley actually took a 25-23 lead at halftime, but the tough Salem defense held the 7-1 Bulldogs to only 11 points in the second half. In all, Bentley managed only 10 field goals in the contest.

"I still feel Bentley is one of the best teams in the area," said a happy Salem coach Bob Blohm after the game. "Although the game was not indicative of that."

"I thought our guards were sensational (Nan Horwood and Eileen Moore) but they had lots of help from Diane Goodrich, Doris Hoelscher, Patty Weidman and Erin Moore underneath."

A frustrated Bentley coach Tom Lang admitted Salem's defense was the difference.

"They played super defense," he said. "The guards didn't let our girls take open shots."

"Salem's the best team we've faced. They are the team to beat in the league."

Salem's junior center Patty Weidman took scoring honors with 16 points. Diane Goodrich's outstanding outside shooting netted 12, while freshman Eileen Moore added nine.

Nan Horwood chipped in with eight and Doris Hoelscher was once again sparkling off the bench with seven points.

Bentley's Shiela DeGrazia was her team's leading scorer with seven points. But guards Carla Hally and Beth Burgess added only six and five points, respectively.

Both seniors usually score in the double figures—a credit to Salem's defense.

The Bulldogs big center Krista Pray was hardly a factor in the contest, committing three fouls in the first three minutes of play. She never

returned until the end of the third quarter when Salem was in complete control.

The Rocks mounted a quick 15-4 lead in the first quarter, but Bentley came back to within four, 15-11, largely due to sharp free throw shooting. Bentley's two-point halftime lead resulted after it converted on 13 of 14 charity tosses.

Salem outscored the Bulldogs 11-4 in the third quarter to take the lead for good.

PLYMOUTH CANTON-MOTT

The Chiefs won their seventh game in eight decisions Tuesday night with an impressive 63-45 Western Six League victory over Waterford Mott at the Corsairs' gym.

Last season, these two teams battled for the top spot in the league with the

Chiefs winning in two close contests. But there was nothing close about this game, as Canton raced to a 16-11 first quarter lead and were never threatened.

"We looked sharp," said Canton coach Mike McCauley. "We really started putting it together. I was happy with this victory."

The Chiefs extended their lead to 41-24 at halftime and blew Mott out of court with a 21-11 streak in the third period.

Senior co-captain Kelly Heston led the Chiefs' scoring with 16 points. Eric Pusek added 10. Kathie Peck and Marianne Piek also scored. Junior J. Pedersen and freshman Reggie Rossien with six points each.

Canton's junior varsity team also won the preliminary game 48-14.

Rock tankers sink Churchill

After losing its first swim meet of the season, Plymouth Salem has now reeled off five straight dual meet victories.

The latest Rock triumph came Tuesday night when they outswam a weak Livonia Churchill squad, 108-59, in non-league action.

Salem swam 28 different girls in the meet, thoroughly dominating the rebuilding Chargers.

"This meet helped our younger girls gain some experience in the water," said Salem coach Chuck Olson. "It was relaxing for some but good for others. Churchill has some good individuals swimmers which helped push some of our girls."

The regular 11-meet event actually featured 12 races when the 100-yard freestyle competition occurred twice when the rope fell during the first attempt.

But that's the only thing which backfired at the Salem pool, as far as the Rocks were concerned.

Salem won both the 200-yard medley relay and the 400-yard freestyle relay. Sharon Ross, Karen Kohler, Sarah Stanwood and Jill McCann won the medley event in 2:07.0, while Kim Coates, Stanwood, Ross and Kim Coates combined to grab the freestyle race.

Salem placed first and second in the 200-yard individual medley when co-captain Laura Perpich and Linda Wochna led all swimmers. McCann followed with a first place finish in the 50-yard freestyle at 27.7.

In the best race of the evening, Stanwood edged Churchill's top swimmer Jackie Rudolph in the 100-yard butterfly. Ross placed first in the 500-yard distance freestyle.

Second place finishers for Salem included Coates in the 200-yard freestyle, Nancy Lazarus in the 100-yard freestyle, Wochna in the 100-yard backstroke and Sue Evans in the 100-yard breaststroke.

Natalie McClumpha took first place honors in the diving competition with a score of 189.75.

The stage is set—Rocks face Trenton for crown

Plymouth-Canton fans can view two football games this weekend at the Centennial Park.

The biggest game of the season in the Suburban Eight League takes place at 8 p.m. Friday when Trenton visits the Park to face Plymouth Salem in a battle of the unbeaten. The contest should more than likely decide which team will win the league championship.

Plymouth Canton takes its 3-2 record against another 3-2 squad, Farmington Harrison, in Western Six League action Saturday night at 7:30 p.m.

THE TALK has been flying between Trenton coach Jack Castignola and Salem's Tom Moshimer, as both men insist the other team should be favored to win. While the words have been abundant, and sometimes down right nasty, both coaches agree that this not only is the biggest game of the year, but also the most difficult task for the 5-0 clubs.

Moshimer goes as far as saying that if his Rocks beat Trenton, it would be his biggest victory in his long 11-year reign at Plymouth—simply because he never expected this team to be undefeated at this time or even be thinking about another Sub-8 title.

"We had a great team last year (regular season undefeated and Sub-8 champs) and to have these kids come back and be 6-0 (with 2 Trenton victory) would be quite an accomplishment for all of them."

Although his once "green" and inexperienced team has improved tremendously in the first five games, Moshimer still feels Trenton is the hands-down favorite to win the game.

"Jack Castignola has nine returning defensive starters and eight returning offensive starters. There's no way he can say we're the favorites," the Salem coach said. "On paper, they (Trenton) are a hell of a lot better than we are."

"This team (Trenton) may be just as good as in 1975 (when the Trojans went undefeated). They aren't as big as 1975 but they are quicker and can break one on you any time."

Word from Trenton is that Salem should be the favorite not only because of its fast start after a 9-0 regular season last year, but because of All-State quarterback Rich Hewlett who generates the potent wishbone attack.

Moshimer, however, says Hewlett is the only returning starter he has back from last year's squad, which gives Trenton the "big edge" in experience.

Moshimer feels his only advantages are at quarterback and in the place-kicking game where Rich Harschu is one of the best around. But he doesn't even consider the home field an edge.

Last year, Salem beat Trenton, 19-7, in Trenton. It marked the third time in the last four years Moshimer squads have beaten Castignola. But last year's confrontation pitted the powerful Rocks

against an inexperienced junior crew from Trenton. The Salem mentor would like to think of this year's game in the same way—with the roles reversed.

He also hopes the results will be reversed where the inexperience of his squad will defeat the powerful and now experienced Trenton team.

THE KEY to the victory is defense, in Moshimer's opinion. Although both squads are known for their big-play offenses, the Salem coach feels the better defensive team will win.

"The key will be if our defense can stop them from moving the ball," Moshimer said. "If we do that we can win. I don't think either team can sustain a consistent drive on the other. Trenton is very tough on defense evidenced by shutting out Edsel Ford (18-0) last week."

"If we outthit them and fly off the ball, we'll be okay. That's what it takes. We have to come out and play 100 percent. They're bigger than we are and they're backs are quicker but we'll give them a battle."

"If we beat Trenton, then I think we have beaten the best around. I think whoever wins has the potential to win the rest of the games this season."

PLYMOUTH CANTON comes off its first homecoming victory in the school's history—an impressive 18-0 victory over Waterford Mott Friday night. Canton, under coach Dave Schuele, presently owns a 3-2 record. The three Chief victories tie a school record for the number of wins in a season.

The Chiefs face Harrison this week. It is, indeed, a game of contrasts where coach John Herffington's squad is coming off a heartbreaking 21-15 setback to Livonia Churchill last week. It was the first Western-6 setback for the two-time defending champions in the last three years. Canton, on the other hand, enjoyed a league victory for the first

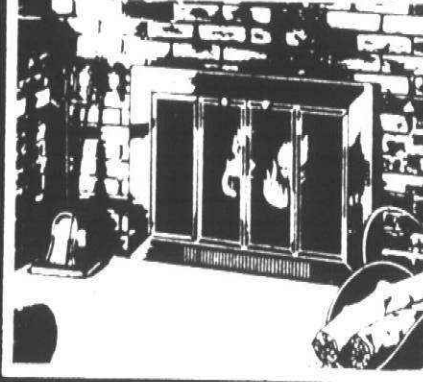

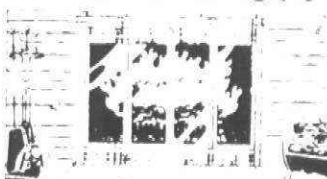

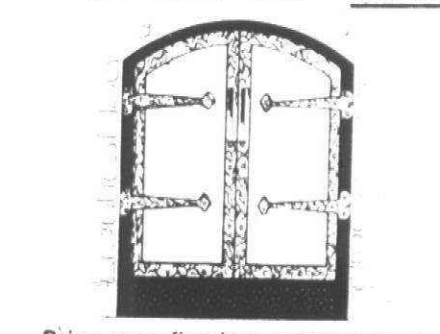

Trenton is better

THIS WEEK'S GAMES
Plymouth Salem's new-found success on the gridiron may have cost Tom Moshimer some respect and credibility with the media.

The Rock football players, if you will remember, were green and inexperienced in August. Only one starter, All-State quarterback Rich Hewlett, was returning from a 9-0 regular season club which won the Suburban Eight League title and went to the state quarterfinals. Some 28 seniors on last year's team graduated.

So the Salem head coach started the season with the pitch that his club would be lucky to win more than five games. He said he would be happy with a first-division finish in the Sub-8 but never thought about seriously contending for a repeat of the league title—that's how inexperienced his club was.

The Rocks, however, have already won five games after five weeks of the season. They are undefeated and face Trenton, everyone's pre-season Sub-8 favorite, Friday night at the Centennial Park (8 p.m.) for what will probably determine the eventual Sub-8 champion this year.

Word around the metropolitan area is that Moshimer has been pulling everyone's leg all season long and never to believe what he says about his team.

Some of my colleagues believe that I have fallen for Moshimer's so-called fairy tales and that I'm a sucker to listen to what he says.

WHILE IT is true that Moshimer's squad has done better than expected, I don't think it's something that Moshimer or his staff ever would have predicted. The Salem mentor, whether he admits it or not, never thought his squad would be this successful.

I don't think it's a hoax on the media everytime the Rocks win a ball game. It's just one more unexpected victory which surprises the coaching staff and probably many of the fans.

Moshimer hasn't been pulling anybody's leg. If anything, it's the team, itself, which is pulling Moshimer's leg every week when it continues to win.

Since the media won't trust Moshimer, many of the papers and polls have the Rocks not only ranked higher than Trenton, but will more than likely pick Salem to beat the Trojans, despite the visitor's pre-season nod.

Only the Detroit Free Press, which at one time ranked Salem in the top 10 in the state, has now rated Trenton higher than the Rocks.

As a member of the media, I must differ with many of my colleagues. I have to believe that Trenton will defeat Salem—although I expect a close battle. One can't argue when it comes to talent.

Trenton is, simply, a much more talented team than Salem—even with Hewlett. They began the season with a senior squad and 17 returning starters.

Mandle comes off the best game ever for a Canton back, rushing 242 yards in 28 carries against Mott.

Schuele credited most of Mandle's success to his offensive line's powerful blocking.

"I thought our blocking up the middle destroyed Mott," the Canton coach said. "But it won't be that easy against Harrison. We're just going to

have to go after them with what we have. I'm sure we'll have to throw the ball more this week.

"We're just going to have to play super good and hope Harrison plays average to win. It'll be a slam-bang game."
