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Is present sign law invalid? Daley says yes

For the past 31 years, Canton businesspersons have complained that prospective customers have been driving past their shops because of a township prohibition on freestanding signs.

Now, in the midst of a controversy over a proposed relaxation of the law, Trustee Eugene Daley has said that the ordinance prohibiting business signs along the roadside is invalid.

Daley based his charge on publication errors he said were made in two local newspapers prior to adoption of the current ordinance in March 1975.

By law, all township ordinances must be published in a newspaper of general circulation before they are adopted. Notification of public hearings must also be published.

CANTON CLERK John Flodin, who is responsible for publishing township-related matters, said he has not had time to research Daley's allegations. The clerk is also responsible for supervising township elections—a task that Flodin said has taken most of his time during the last few weeks.

But if Daley's allegations are correct and the current sign law is invalid, township planner Jim Kosteva said the status of business signs will have to be researched by Canton attorneys.

Kosteva said, however, that township officials probably will not issue permits for signs that might violate provisions of the current ordinance until the present law can be amended.

Changes in the current ordinance that would allow erection of freestanding signs have already been proposed by the Canton Planning Commission.

The township board appeared ready to adopt the ordinance when opponents of the proposed law discovered that the planning commission had inaccurately published notification of public hearings.

The technicality will stall enactment

of the revised ordinance until mid-December, if it is enacted at all. Four new township board members who will be inaugurated Nov. 20 are opposed to the proposed ordinance in its present form.

DALEY SAID the technicality spurred his decision to research the publication of the ordinance adopted by the previous township board in 1975.

Daley said the current ordinance was never published in full after it was introduced and tabled for publication by the Canton board on March 11, 1975. He said that only a portion of the ordinance was published in the March 24 edition of the Canton Observer.

The ordinance was approved by the township board on March 25.

The trustee also maintained that another newspaper chain inaccurately published notification of a public hearing on the ordinance before it was adopted. Daley said the notification was published in an edition of the newspaper that did not circulate in Canton Township.

"Something's funny somewhere," said Daley, one of three township board members who will retain their seats after Nov. 20.

Site OK granted for Burger Chef

Plans for a Burger Chef restaurant on Ford Road just east of I-275 will go ahead as planned now that the township board has approved the site plan.

The board Tuesday approved, 5-1, the newest fast-food restaurant request, with only Trustee Robert Meyers dissenting.

The request for site plan approval had been tabled from the Nov. 8 board meeting because a colored rendering of the proposed building was not submitted.

The drawing was presented Tuesday. The architectural firm for the restaurant, Happle-Johns and Associates, has also requested that requirements for a five-foot sidewalk in front of the new Burger Chef be waived until the board decides there is enough pedestrian traffic to warrant one.

The site plan approval came with little discussion or controversy. The first time Burger Chef representatives made the request for site plan approval, members of the audience

raised objections to allowing another fast-food establishment to be built along Ford Road.

Protesters included Canton's newly elected officials, such as Supervisor-elect Noel Culbert and Treasurer-elect James Donahue. Lame duck Supervisor Harold Stein and Treasurer Anne Bradley did not attend the Nov. 8 meeting.

Both Bradley and Stein voted in favor of the site plan Tuesday. Clerk John Flodin, who voted in favor of tabling the request Nov. 8, was not present Tuesday.

At the first discussion of the site plan, Canton planner Jim Kosteva said he doubted the township board could legally deny fast-food site plan approvals if the plans meet the criteria of the township's current zoning ordinance.

The site plan approval marked one of the last decisions made by the present township board.

New officials will be sworn into office Monday, Nov. 20, and will conduct the next board meeting Nov. 28.

Myers clears beer bash rap

The Wayne County prosecutor's office will not file misdemeanor charges against Canton Trustee Robert Myers for serving beer at a campaign party last summer without a one-day liquor permit.

Myers, who ran an unsuccessful campaign for a 27th District Wayne County Board of Commissioners seat in the August primary, planned the party at the UAW Hall on Michigan Avenue last July to raise funds for his campaign.

The event—which turned into a "private party" for about 25 of Myers' friends—was visited by Canton police who asked the prosecuting attorney's office to issue a warrant for Myers' arrest.

At first, a prosecuting attorney recommended issuing the warrant because Myers had not obtained a liquor permit. But under pressure from Myers' attorney, prosecutors agreed to withhold the warrant pending further investigation.

LAST THURSDAY, the prosecutor's office decided to drop the entire case.

"We thought this was an unreasonable thing they pulled on him," said Robert Sage, deputy chief of the out-county prosecuting attorney's office. "The man has no criminal record. And we're not here to make criminals."

Myers has maintained that the bust of his campaign party was politically motivated. He blames Supervisor Harold Stein, Treasurer Anne Bradley, Trustee Eugene Daley and Police Chief Walter MacGregor for the political aggravation.

The three township board trustees have denied any connections with the bust, and MacGregor insists that his department's action against Myers was not politically motivated.

Myers admits that he did not obtain a one-day liquor permit for the party.

He thought the UAW hall was covered by a blanket liquor permit.

"I admit I was wrong in not obtaining that license," said Myers, whose term on the Canton board expires Monday. "I also admit that I was naive, because I thought the hall was covered by a blanket liquor license."

"But how many weddings and parties have been held in that hall? The UAW holds meetings in that hall, and they often serve beer. I've never heard of a bust of UAW members."

MYERS MAINTAINS that the Wayne County Sheriff's Department informed township police of the "beer bash" and the candidate's failure to obtain a liquor permit.

Myers said MacGregor informed him on the morning of the event that township police would be forced to bust the party because Myers had failed to obtain the liquor license.

The trustee said he telephoned everyone who had purchased tickets to tell them that the fundraiser had been cancelled. He refunded the \$10 supporters had paid and invited about 25 of his close friends to attend a "private" party.

Between lost campaign funds and the cost of furnishing beer, food and entertainment, Myers figures he lost about \$1,600 on the event that was planned as a fundraiser.

"I'm very bitter about the whole thing," Myers said. "I think it's very unfortunate that the chief (MacGregor) chose to get involved in politics."

MacGregor would not comment on Myers' charge beyond saying that the bust of Myers' party was not politically motivated.

"I did what I thought I had to do," the police chief said. "I don't see any reason to continue throwing the ball back and forth across the net."

Committee tapped to develop bond issues for schools

A citizens advisory committee has been appointed to make recommendations on developing a bond issue program for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Appointment of the advisory group was approved Monday night by a 6-0 vote of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

In discussing formation of the study group, board president Thomas Yack and vice-president Richard Arlen urged members to take an independent look at construction needs and form its own opinions.

Rapid growth in pupil population and several years of deferred building maintenance have resulted in major bonding needs in the school district.

A central administration budget committee is now studying the need for two bond issues, an operating renewal and a request for additional operating taxes. The administration findings are still in the preliminary stage and won't come before the school board for action until after the citizens' committee submits a recommendation.

THE BOND ISSUE Advisory Committee will review available data on building needs. Members also may request additional information or investigate any area related to the bond issue.

The committee's assignment is to consider the size and distribution of a bond proposal and assess community attitudes on a school bond issue. Written recommendations will be given to the school board in mid-February 1979.

Members of the advisory group will seek maximum community input and involvement, according to the school board instructions. Members will have contact with resources including the administrative budget and boundary committee, Plymouth-Canton Education Association, Parent-Teacher organizations, public forums, PACTS (citizen involvement organization), surveys and consultants.

Yack will schedule the first meeting of the committee—possibly as early as this Monday. The committee then will elect its own chairperson.

Yack commented that the school board has had informal discussions on naming a citizens' committee for the past 8-12 weeks. Yack added that Supt.

John M. Hoben will be the administrative liaison with the committee.

"The administrative recommendations on bonding are not already edged

in concrete, but is just an information bank available to the committee which can either accept or reject it," Yack said.

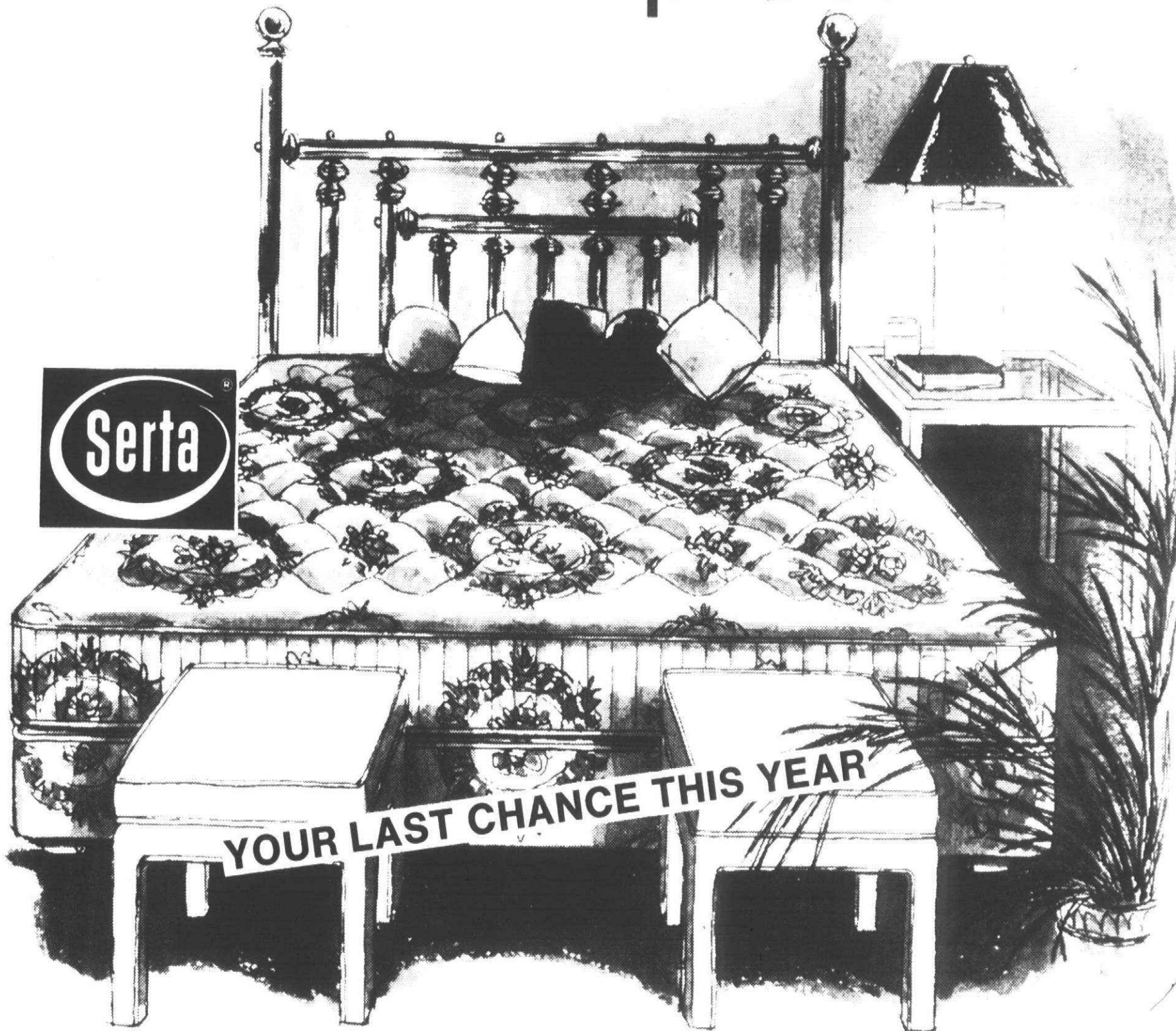

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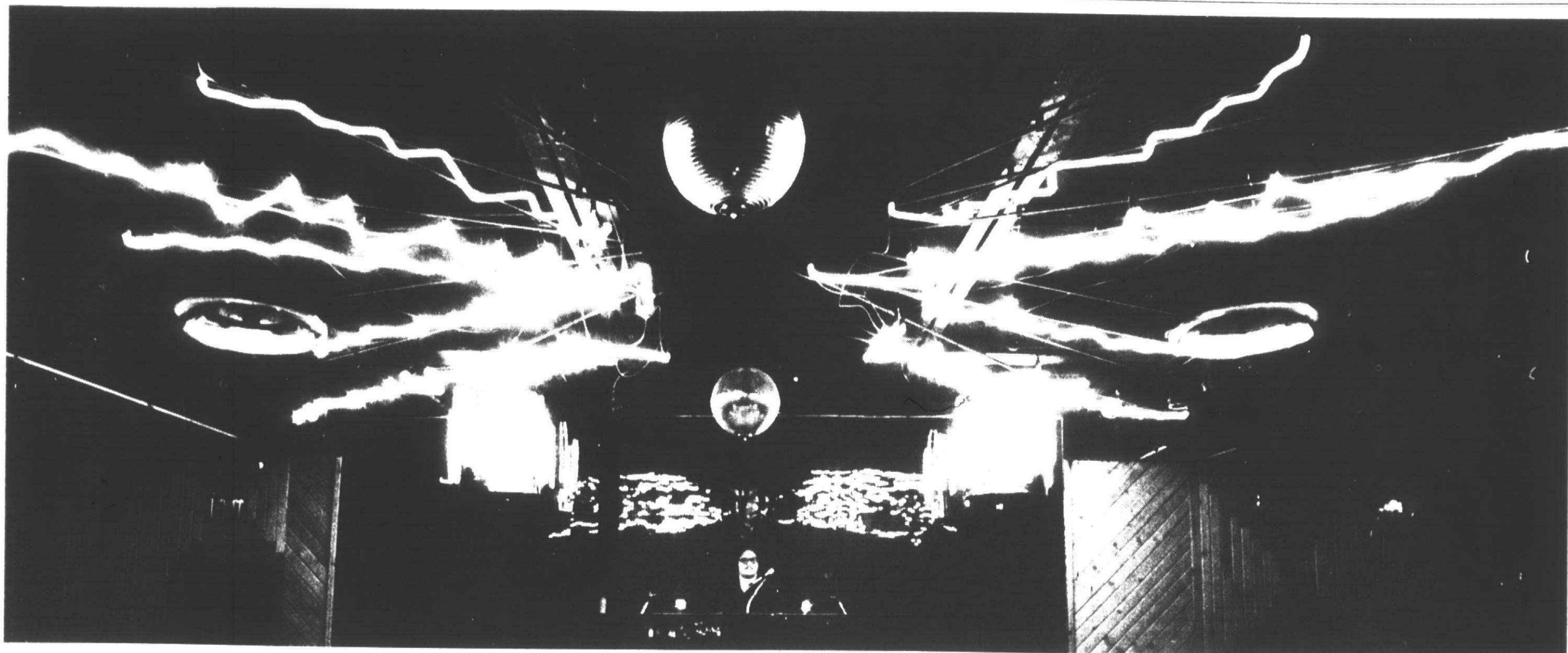
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"Krazy" (disc jockey Don Korzeniewski) presides over the dance floor at Mr. Magoo's.

Teachers leave books to spread disco fever

They used to provide the three R's—reading, riting and rithmetic.

Now they're providing the three D's—disco, drink and dancing.

Brothers John, Glen and Dale Cabautan and partner Terrille Nickels have come a long way from the days when they all taught school.

The four men have recently opened their second disco in the area, Mr. Magoo's on Michigan Avenue in Canton. They owned The Connection in Flat Rock for about two years.

Although the new disco has only been open two months, the partners say the place is packed on weekends.

They are already expanding their disco fare. According to Glen, Mr. Magoo's will sponsor its first teen disco from 2-5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 19.

"We won't have any liquor—just soft drinks and snacks," he says.

There will be a \$2 admission charge for the teens (Glen says they're trying to reach the 15-17 age bracket), which will include free disco dance lessons.

If all works out, the partners hope to expand the teen disco sessions to Saturday afternoons as well.

THERE ARE other plans in store for Mr. Magoo's.

According to Terry Nickels, the partners are exploring the possibility of setting up an "American Bandstand kind of thing" that would be televised on a local station.

The television venture would probably be in conjunction with the teen disco.

Terry says the teen disco isn't a response to the recently passed proposal setting the drinking age at 21 once again.

The average crowd at Mr. Magoo's, he says, tends to be comprised of people 21 and up. About the only prerequisite for attending the disco seems to be a willingness to have a good time. "The people who come here aren't plastic people. We have some who come all dressed up and some who don't. They all just come to enjoy themselves."

For some, enjoyment means dancing. And the new club has enough equipment to please even the most hardened disco fan.

There is the standard disc jockey (in fact there are three DJ's who alternate between Mr. Magoo's and The Connection).

There is \$70,000 worth of sound and light equipment to surround patrons with music and color.

There is even a fog machine that belches out white clouds around those on the dance floor.

Several celebrity acts featuring such entertainers as Steve Dahl and Jim Harper have been sponsored at Mr. Magoo's since it opened. But the recorded disco sound remains the big draw.

Those sounds are subject to change. Don "Krazy" Korzeniewski, DJ coordinator for both Mr. Magoo's and The Connection, says he doesn't even play Bee Gee songs anymore.

He says the most requested songs now are "McArthur's Park," "In the Bush" and "Instant Replay."

The four partners may even open more discos in the future. For now, with two successful operations, no one is complaining.

Not bad for four former school teachers, none over 30.

Their secret, Glen says, is providing a friendly atmosphere and good music.

He adds, "And there's something new going on all the time."

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Wayne-Westland Schools to consider tax hike

A task force of 14 Wayne-Westland district administrators has been appointed to study the need for a millage increase and how to present that need to the public.

The last operating millage increase was 12 years ago, and voters may be asked to approve an increase sometime next year.

Deputy Supt. Dennis O'Neill is heading the task force.

"We're going to meet next week to review program costs. I think there's no sense kidding ourselves. Some millage increase is going to be required, but there's some question as to how

much," said O'Neill.

A final decision on whether to schedule a millage election and, if so, how much to ask for, will be made by the board by the end of this year.

In the meantime, the task force will split into four groups, based on junior high attendance areas. (Part of Canton Township is included in the Wayne-Westland district). The task force will regroup and present its report to Supt. Timothy Dyer the first week in December.

Dyer then will make his recommendations to the board.

"We are investigating the necessity

of going for added millage as early as possible in order to prepare reports for you," Dyer told the board Monday night.

Declining enrollment is the beginning of the "numbers game," in which the district will probably lose another 800 to 900 students by the time school opens next fall.

The district used broadened continuing education programs to bolster its sagging state aid funding. But that method of compensating for declining enrollments can't go on forever and ever," according to Dyer.

The numbers game is expected to

continue in the next funding year, said Dyer. The "inflationary spiral" and, possibly, the recently approved tax limitation amendment, will force the state Legislature to continue the same "style of funding education."

That style, said Dyer, is a formula that bases state aid on the volume of students in a school system.

The new tax limitation amendment could be reflected in the operating funds the district receives from state aid and property taxes. Both will be limited to the rate of growth of personal income.

Operating millage currently is 34.16

mills for Wayne, Westland and Canton Township. That means residents pay \$34.16 for every \$1,000 of assessed valuation, which is half the market value of the property.

Westland residents this year will pay a total of \$8.6 million in school taxes. For Canton residents the figure is \$339,463 and in Wayne the amount of property tax is nearly \$5.4 million this year.

State aid funding is expected to be more than \$21 million this year for that portion based on student attendance.

Voters in the district can, however, provide for a property tax increase above the one-year rate of growth by approving a millage request.

Faced with an already "austere"

budget for the 1978-79 school year, district administrators are wary of the 1979-80 budget.

Administrators know that this year's budget must include money to make up a projected \$400,000 deficit from the 1977-78 budget year. The actual deficit figure won't be known until the audit is completed.

When the budget was adopted last month, Dyer told the board that about \$1.5 million was eliminated from the budget by dropping field trips, in-service training, new teaching materials and custodial overtime. This year's budget totals about \$43 million.

Dyer emphasized that school programs remained "intact" in this year's budget. The future of those programs, however, could depend on an increased millage.

State police director dies Nov. 13

Col. Fredrick Davids of Plymouth, former director of the Michigan State Police, died Tuesday at age 64.

After serving 33 years with the State Police, including five as director, Davids retired from public life in 1970 except for service on the Plymouth Township Planning Commission.

Davids was chairman of the planning commission this year, and was vice-chairman last year.

Funeral arrangements are being handled by Schrader Funeral Home in Plymouth.

COL. DAVIDS, born in 1914 at Hope in Midland County, joined the State Police on Nov. 1, 1937.

He served at the East Lansing and Ypsilanti posts before being promoted to district detective in 1941 and assigned to the Fire Marshal Division at second district headquarters in Detroit.

He was promoted to detective sergeant in 1949 and then was selected as first commander of the rackets squad when it was organized in 1951.

Promoted to detective lieutenant in 1954, Davids was assigned to second district headquarters and the next year returned to the uniform division as assistant district commander.

When promoted to captain in 1956, Davids was transferred to the superintendent's office at East Lansing headquarters, then returned to Detroit two years later to command the second district.

Governor George Romney appointed Davids commissioner in 1965 upon the retirement of Commissioner Joseph Childs. The title of commissioner later was changed to director under a state reorganization plan.

As State Police director, Davids also served as state fire marshal, director of state civil defense, director of the Office of Emergency Planning, direc-

tor of the emergency task force, director of the State Safety Commission.

During that time, Davids also served as ex-officio member of the State Department of Aeronautics and State Electrical Board. He was chairman of the Law Enforcement Officers Training Council, and secretary for the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police.

Col. Davids also served as a member of the executive board of the Michigan United Fund, a board member of Traveler's Aid in Detroit, and was a committee member in various civic undertakings.

Davids and his wife Kathleen lived on Plymouth Road in Plymouth Township in an historical centennial farm house which they worked together to restore during his free time.

Col. Davids retired as director on Oct. 17, 1970 but remained active as a resident of the Plymouth community.

Township firefighters say staff is too low in Plymouth Twp.

Plymouth Township fails to provide adequate fire and rescue services, township firefighters have charged.

They believe the township is running the risk of a tragedy by allowing understaffing at Station No. 2.

Seven-year veteran Randy Maycock has worked 43 days out of 84 this year by himself at Station No. 2 at Lake Pointe, a situation he labeled reprehensible.

If a rescue run came in, Maycock said he would have to look to the two men at Station No. 2 at Township Hall for assistance.

"We handle all the runs down here if Station No. 2 only has one man," confirmed Sgt. Fred Knupp, who has been with the township force for nearly 19 years.

"If he (Maycock) had a rescue run across from the station, he couldn't respond immediately. We will not send the rescue squad with one man," he said.

The township won't agree to a four-man minimum on duty, the firefighters said.

"Any time you want to do something, they make you feel like a crook," Maycock said bluntly. He ordered two cans of wax last June, intending to wax the firetruck for July 4th celebrations.

He's still waiting for the less than \$5 dollar purchase.

The township isn't interested in improved training, he said. Township administrators don't understand modern firefighting, he said.

"We're constantly changing to keep up with new methods for fighting fires. You don't throw water every time—that went out with the bucket brigade. Firefighting is a science today—you need to know how to put out chemical fires, and with the opening of the freeway, there's even more to learn about techniques. But we can't get enough men on duty to answer rescue runs, let alone train for situations," Maycock said.

Township administrators admitted the department has problems, but they declined to elaborate. According to Supt. Tom Notebaert, without a chief to direct changes, the township can't make any major moves.

The department has been without a chief since last April.

WITH 12 firefighters and 10 volunteers on the force, understaffing is critical, the firefighters charge. In fact, most firefighters work an average of 10 hours per week overtime. And some refuse to be called back.

"It's not uncommon to work 72 hours

straight with 24 hours overtime," said Greg Westfall, with the force for two years.

The firefighters work on a nine-week cycle, with three 24-hour days on and four days off. When they're called in on their days off, they collect overtime.

At Station No. 2, there's a rescue squad, two pumps and an aerial unit. When only one man is on duty, the equipment cannot be used until other men are called in.

The mutual aid program with the City of Plymouth is a good one, they said, but it should be used for emergencies, not to supplement a lack of manpower.

In Canton Township, the firefighters point out, five firefighters on duty are maintained at each station. But Plymouth Township is ultra-conservative with the pursestrings, Maycock charged.

Maycock is convinced a five-year program with a .75 mill boost could turn the township's firefighting capabilities around. And if residents expressed their concern, administrators might tackle some of the problems, he said.

"Everyone wants something for nothing," Maycock said, "but you just can't get it."

Canton UF fund drive successful

Canton's United Foundation fund drive has already yielded \$1,354.60, with foundation members expecting more to come.

According to Mary Jo Ochylski, one of the local co-chairwomen, the amount collected is more than \$300 ahead of last year's figure for Canton contributions. This is the first year Canton has had its own fund.

"We feel we could have done much better if we had been able to get more area leaders and they in turn could have had more doorbell ringers," Mrs. Ochylski says.

She adds that people wishing to contribute can still do so by having a payroll deduction designated to the Canton United Foundation fund.

The other chairwomen for the drive are Margo Whiting and Esther Wilcox.

One UF-sponsored agency is in Canton, but township residents take advantage of services offered in five areas.

Those services include child care, institutional care, family services, legal aid and health services.

Other Canton residents receive nursing services from the Visiting Nurse Association, the Detroit Orthopaedic Clinic and the National Council on Alcohol of Greater Detroit.

These organizations all receive UF funds.

License is for hall, Elias owner says

Waitresses at the Elias Brothers Big Boy on Ford Road will not serve alcoholic beverages to their customers even if restaurant owner Peter Khoury succeeds in winning a liquor license for his facility.

Khoury appeared before the Canton board last week to request a liquor license for his restaurant and a banquet facility he hopes to build behind the Big Boy.

The four township board members who attended the meeting unanimously denied Khoury's request, but invited the restaurant owner to reappear before the board once standards for granting liquor licenses are established.

The restaurant owner told the Observer this week, however, that he has no plans to serve alcoholic beverages to Big Boy customers. He plans to prepare foods and drinks in the restaurant, then carry the preparations to the proposed banquet hall.

"If I didn't make it clear to the board (that liquor would not be served in the restaurant), I sure made it clear to them after the meeting," Khoury said.

The restaurant owner said many of his customers are concerned that

liquor on the Big Boy menu would destroy the restaurant's family atmosphere.

"I wouldn't serve liquor in my restaurant if the man in the moon offered me \$1 million," Khoury said.

The restaurant owner said he is now working on site plans for the banquet facility he hopes to build behind the Big Boy. But site plans for the hall that Khoury says would seat 300 to 500 persons are not finalized.

As a rule, the township board does not grant liquor licenses for proposed facilities until site plans are approved. But Khoury says he will not spend money on detailed architectural drawings if he cannot obtain a liquor license.

Khoury's request for a liquor license stirred considerable concern among residents who are opposed to recent liquor license allocations to the Palace and Canton House restaurants.

The residents feared that granting a liquor license to Big Boy would lead to additional liquor license requests from the fast-food restaurants on Ford Road.

The township currently holds five liquor licenses, according to Canton Clerk John Flodin.

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Crossing guard cost issue may hit courts

Plymouth Township will again be receiving a communication asking it to share in the cost of providing crossing guards for school children.

The request is being sent by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, who share half-and-half with Canton and the City of Plymouth in providing crossing guards.

But despite that sharing with two governmental units, the schools expect to receive a "no thank you" message from Plymouth Township in return.

That's because the school board has asked the township before to share half the cost of crossing guards, and each time the township has declined. The township still has received bills for the service, and now is about four years and \$25,000 in arrears.

A recent development, prompting another request, is a ruling in Oakland County Circuit Court that the expense of providing crossing guards is one which belongs to a municipality. That decision is being appealed to the Michigan Court of Appeals.

But the court ruling adds ammunition to Supt. John M. Hoben's belief that the school district is correct in asking Plymouth Township to pick up half the bill for crossing guards at school sites and major intersections in the township.

If the township declines again, Hoben is expected to consult with school district attorneys to see whether the issue shouldn't be raised again in the courts.

A couple of years ago the City of Plymouth threatened to discontinue paying for crossing guards in the city unless Plymouth Township agreed to begin sharing the expense.

AFTER THE TOWNSHIP refused to pay its half, the school district stopped providing crossing guards in Plymouth Township. Local attorney James McCarthy then filed a lawsuit, and Wayne Circuit Court issued an injunction ordering the school district to reinstate the guards.

At that point the court ruled the crossing guards should be provided, and stated it would decide at a later date how the guards would be paid. But the court then ignored the payment issued, which remains unresolved.

Hoben told the school board Monday night he has directed Ray Hoedel, Assistant Supt. for Business, to bill the township for crossing guards. If payment isn't made, Hoben added, he will ask the district's attorney, Ed Draugelis, about making a request to Wayne Circuit Court to order the township to pay.

In Oakland County some municipalities pay the entire expense, but most share with the school districts, Hoben noted. In Wayne County the common practice is for municipalities to share crossing guard expenses with school districts.

Plymouth Township has maintained that it is a school decision whether to provide crossing guards, and that the schools maintain supervision over, and set policy for, crossing guards. Therefore, the township argues, it is a school responsibility to finance crossing guards.

At one point the school district also requested an attorney general's opinion, but the ruling, when issued, was indecisive and left the decision up to the discretion of the township and school board.

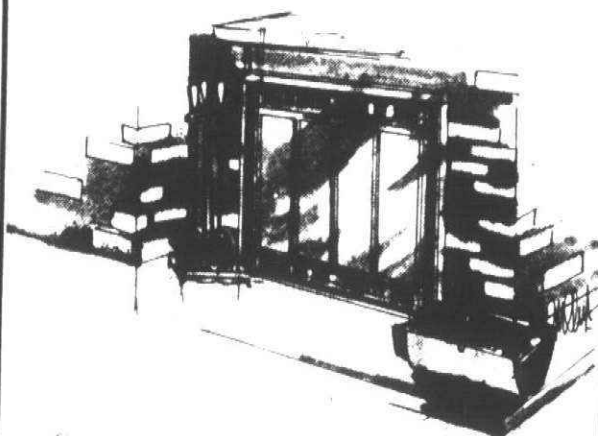

Local senior citizens to get new wheels soon

Plymouth senior citizens will have new wheels this December, while seniors in the entire Plymouth-Plymouth Township area may have use of a new van late next year.

The City of Plymouth is purchasing a van, hopefully to be equipped with special hoists, for use by both senior citizens and the handicapped in the city.

With about \$16,000 from the special needs category of Community Development program funding and a driver from Wayne County's Office on Aging, the city hopes to have the program operational some time next month.

Although a firm schedule has not been made, some of the van's time will be allotted to getting the elderly to the nutrition program at Tonquish Creek Manor, says Sharon Thomas, executive secretary of the housing project.

Because only 15 per cent of the nutrition program's meals can be sent home, more seniors provided for at the manor will allow home meals for those who cannot get out, she explains.

And the van will be used to shuttle the elderly and handicapped to Wayne County's J Building in Westland for low-cost prescriptions, health facilities, doctors' appointments, and other needs in the area.

"We're just thrilled to death about this," Ms. Thomas says, adding that Tonquish Creek is expanding also. The 60-unit senior citizen housing project will open a 48-unit addition hopefully in May, 1980. Currently 35 units receive federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) subsidies.

MEANWHILE, the Plymouth Community Coun-

cil on Aging is attempting to get grant approval for a van for use by senior citizens in the area.

The Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) recently endorsed the council's application for a 16-passenger specially equipped van under the federal and state grants.

"It's in the pipeline," says council president Walter Fletcher, commenting on the application's advancement. The council is awaiting approval from the federal Urban Mass Transit Administration (UMTA) and the Michigan State Department of Highways and Transportation for a 16 B-2 grant, which provides federal and state funding of the project.

However, because the Plymouth area is not specifically rural which the grant program requires, the council's proposed van may get a low priority, one official says.

However, SEMCOG's endorsement was a plus, they say. The van would supplement other senior citizen transportation in the area, now provided by the Canton, Northville, Plymouth Family YMCA and Salvation Army, which lends its 50-passenger bus for senior trips.

The council's grant application calls for a 16-passenger van, with special hoist, with full purchase funding to be shared by federal and county sources. Council spokespersons are hoping to get a driver with Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) funds through Wayne County.

But both the council and the City of Plymouth will be seeking additional funding for maintenance of equipment and gasoline, they agree. Hopefully, some community agencies will help out in the cause, Ms. Thomas says.

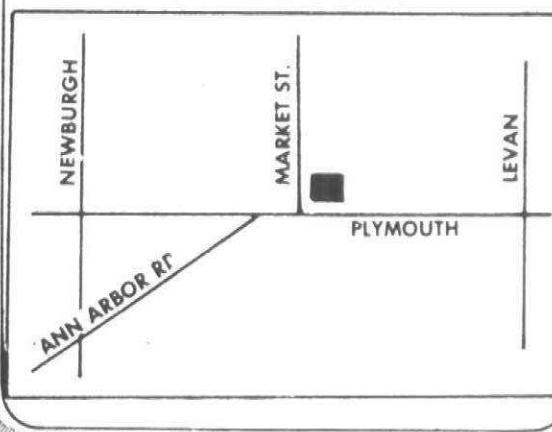

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Railroad depot location regretted

George Starkweather held public office in Plymouth during two wars—the Civil War and the Spanish-American War.

He was township supervisor in 1862 when Company C, 24th Infantry Regiment of the celebrated "Iron Brigade," was organized in Plymouth. It was the Iron Brigade that suffered many casualties at Fredericksburg when the Union forces were repulsed by the Confederates.

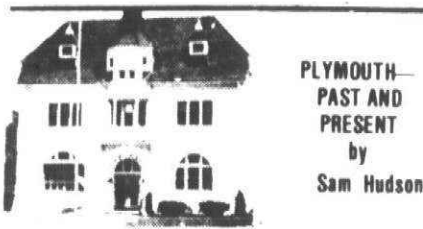
Twenty-eight per cent of the entire population of the community was in uniform when Starkweather was supervisor. Men from Plymouth distinguished themselves at the Battle of Gettysburg. During the first day's fighting, the 24th suffered 80 per cent casualties.

Other Plymouthites fought at Gettysburg under General George A. Custer, who commanded the Michigan Cavalry Brigade. Still others, in the 4th Michigan Cavalry, captured Jefferson Davis, president of the Confederate States of America, near the end of the war.

Thirty-three years after the Civil War ended, George Starkweather was in office again. This time, at age 72, he was president of the village when the nation was involved in the Spanish-American War.

Starkweather's counterpart today as township supervisor, Tom Notebaert, saw military service during World War II.

He was 19 when the United States declared war on Japan and Germany and was in the military three years, seeing action with the 104th Infantry Division of the First Army in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

NINE YEARS BEFORE the Civil War began, Starkweather made a personal decision that he may have regretted in later years. It had to do with the coming of the railroads to Plymouth.

As noted earlier, the advent of the railroads in 1871 helped Plymouth Township to attract industry, as Starkweather expected. But he erred in believing that locating the depot in the northern section of the town would cause the focal point in Plymouth to shift from Kellogg Park to the station area.

To capitalize on his hunch that the depot would become the hub of the community, Starkweather opened a road through his property in what has been called Lower Town, North Village and, most recently, Old Village. (North Village is the more appropriate name because the section is neither lower, nor older, than the Kellogg Park area.)

The road Starkweather opened in 1870 led north from Main Street, and he called it Oak Street. Sometime after his death, the village council renamed it Starkweather Avenue. His name also is commemorated by Starkweather School in North Village.

Starkweather did more than attempt to develop his property. He built a brick building at the corner of what now is Starkweather and Liberty streets. He moved his general store

from the Kellogg Park area into this new building. It is to be doubted that the trade he got at the new location was any better, or even equal to, that which he enjoyed at what continued to remain the center of town.

As previously indicated, Starkweather led the unsuccessful effort to convince Northville that it should remain in Plymouth Township. His problem, in 1898, was a matter of secession.

BY CONTRAST, the problem facing Plymouth Township supervisors in recent years has been annexation—a problem brought on by the city's periodic attempt to break out of its 2.06 square mile confine.

In May 1955 the city did manage to annex 85 acres of the township when it absorbed the Cassidy property at the corner of Sheldon and North Territorial roads. In the same year, it made an unsuccessful attempt to annex the entire township. And it has failed thus far in an effort to acquire the Burroughs plant property in the township on Plymouth Road at Haggerty.

In May 1974 a drive to merge city and township governments was rejected by township voters 2,706 to 763. Soon thereafter, the city commission attempted, without success, to annex the Hillside Inn property on Plymouth Road, the Burroughs Corporation parking lot across from the Inn, and the township in its entirety.

In recent times, the city has been less aggressive in attempts at annexation. Instead, effort has focused on the desirability of consolidating city and township services. It is claimed that such a move would save money for the taxpayers of both governmental bodies.

CONSOLIDATION of services is

within the realm of possibility, but will the city and the township, as political entities, ever combine?

Asked this question recently, Tom Notebaert answered "perhaps." But not, he added, until "the people of the township decide that they are willing to pay for additional services."

He noted that the township now levies on 3.5 mills per thousand, while the city levies 16.45 per thousand. He also pointed out that, as recently as August 1976, township voters turned down by a substantial margin a proposal to increase their taxes by two mills to provide the township with its own police force.

One thing has not changed in the township since the days when George Starkweather was supervisor—that is the law governing the reimbursement of a citizen whose livestock is killed by dogs.

The law still requires that the township supervisor investigate the incident and validate the owner's claim before he is reimbursed by the county. It was enacted in an era when local farmers raised sheep, and the Plymouth Carding Mill served wool-growers throughout southeastern Michigan. The rate paid for a sheep killed by dogs, in Starkweather's day, was \$3 per head.

While no cases of sheep-killing have been reported in recent times, Notebaert says that last year the owner of a turkey farm on North Territorial Road was reimbursed when 11 of his birds were destroyed by stray dogs. Less fortunate was the owner of a pet goat, attacked by a dog on McClumpha Road in 1976. He attempted to collect \$35 to pay for veterinary fees, but was turned down by the township board.

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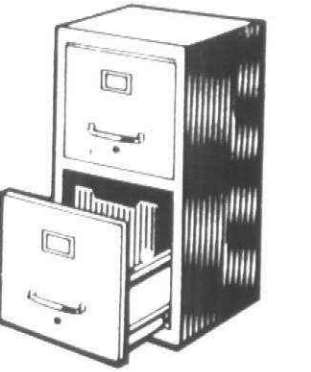
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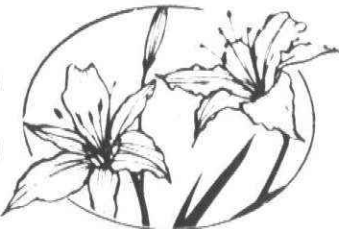
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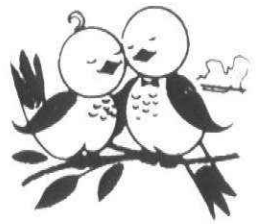
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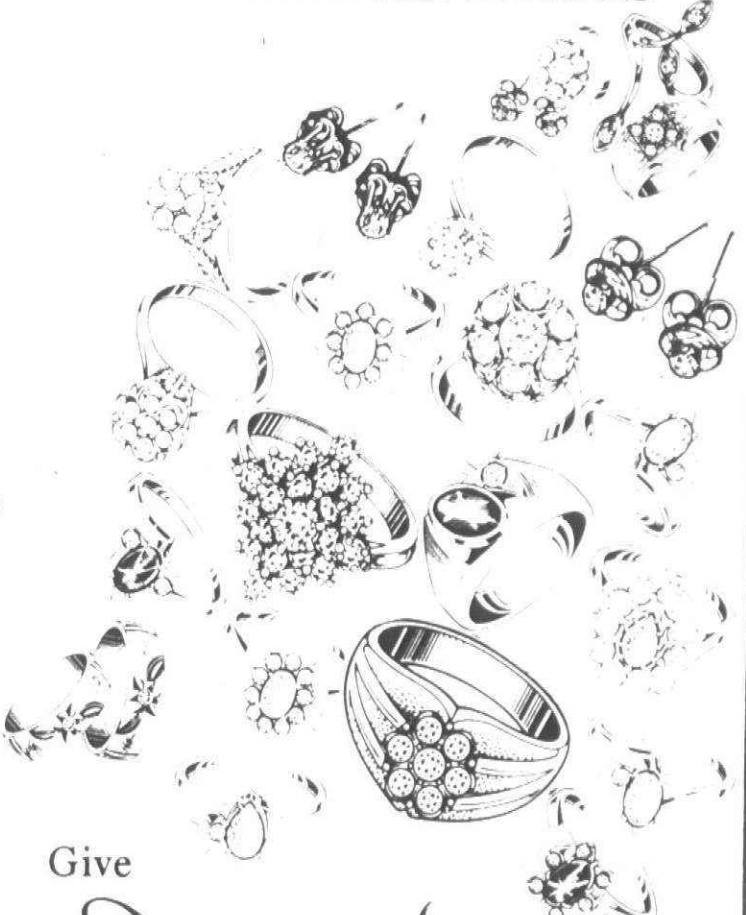

Schoolcraft is still without a contract

Schoolcraft College faculty and office personnel may have well-stuffed Christmas stockings by mid-December.

It won't be gifts, however. It will be retroactive pay—if the two unions ratify contracts with the community college by then.

The bargaining team for the 350-member Faculty Forum spent two hours Monday putting the report of court-appointed fact-finder George T. Roumell Jr. into contract language.

Roumell recommended retroactive pay to Aug. 24, when the new contract would take effect.

A FACULTY union spokesman said, however, that the Forum hasn't agreed to one major Roumell proposal: that part-time instructors get an increase of 4.5 per cent the first year and nothing the second year of a two-year pact.

That suggestion has apparently upset many part-time instructors. The union is seeking an improvement. Roumell's report is not binding on either party.

Roumell recommended raises for the 160-plus full-time instructors of seven per cent and six per cent, respectively, for the two years.

Roumell was appointed after the unions went on strike for eight days. The strike was ended Sept. 27 by circuit court order. The fact-finding process took about a month.

MATTERS ARE more routine in negotiations with the 62-member Schoolcraft College Association of Office Personnel (SCAOP), bargaining agent for secretaries and clerks.

SCAOP's bargaining team met last Friday to discuss implementing the fact-finder's report, according to union president Dorothy Irving.

"We made some wording changes. Then we have to have it typed out," said Mrs. Irving. She expects a ratification vote about Nov. 29.

By that schedule, the board of trustees would be able to ratify the two contracts sometime in December. A regular board meeting is scheduled for Dec. 13, but a college spokesman said President C. Nelson Grote is hoping to arrange a Dec. 6 ratification meeting.

"The feeling is good," said Mrs. Irving of the SCAOP negotiations. SCAOP's old contract expired in June of 1977, and the office personnel have worked since then without a contract.

No dollar figure was immediately available on how much retroactive pay the combined 412 college employees will receive.

But if there are no major snags in negotiations, they should have their money by Christmas.



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The life of a seminarian

Like most college students, Tom Bolster wears jeans and a knit shirt to classes.

Like most college students, he has added his own personal touches to his dormitory room—a lounge chair inherited from a graduate and the usual stereo turntable and receiver.

Like most students, Tom is budget-conscious. An evening away from his studies is likely to include a \$1.25 movie at either Northville or Plymouth, topped off by a pizza before he returns to campus.

But unlike most college students, Tom pays no tuition for his 15 hours a semester of graduate study, nor does he foot the bill for his room and board. He doesn't have to worry about finding a job because when he graduates, a job will be waiting for him.

IN RETURN FOR these fringes, Tom will dedicate his life to helping other people. A student at St. John's Seminary, he is studying to be a priest.

He does not view his vocational choice as sacrificial.

"I feel called by Jesus Christ. That's the reason for my being here. I feel this is what I can do to help other people, and in so doing my own life will move toward completion."

Tom lives and attends school in the massive red-brick seminary on the southeast corner of Sheldon and Five Mile Roads. Located on 179 acres which boast a nine-hole golf course, tennis courts and an orchard, the impressive edifice features a multitude of arched windows typical of its Umbrian design, an Italian architectural style.

As guest master, Tom is comfortable directing visitors through the long, quiet hallways, past the octagonal stone pillars in the foyer, under the ceiling's bas-relief flowers and filigrees.

He made his decision to become a priest while an undergraduate at University of Florida, where he started out majoring in political science but ended up earning a degree in religious studies.

DURING THOSE undergraduate years, he didn't always go to church in that period of "search for greater meaning."

Even though born into a devout Catholic family, he did not attend Catholic school as a child.

"I have always seen God as part of my life, so it was not such a drastic leap of faith to consider the priesthood. I believe everybody is called to live and witness Christ in their lives, no matter what their vocations—policeman, lawyers or priests."

Before being admitted to study for the priesthood, seminarians must have college degrees, but their majors are unimportant. One St. John's student has an engineering degree. Another middle-aged seminarian was away from college life for many years, working as a department store manager, before deciding to pursue his master of divinity degree.

A TYPICAL DAY for seminarians begins at 7 a.m. There's no mad scramble for the shower because each student has his own in a private bathroom attached to his room.

Tom attributes this luxurious dormitory touch to the seminary's founder, Edward Cardinal Mooney, former archbishop of Detroit.

When the seminary was built in 1949, life for future priests was more restrictive than it is today. In those days students were cloistered and were not allowed to have cars, to smoke or drink or even to have phones in their rooms.

Because students were not allowed to leave the premises, Cardinal Mooney wanted special comforts provided for them. Among these accommodations are a gymnasium, racquetball courts, a weight room and a bowling alley.

Classes begin at 8:10 a.m. This semester Tom is studying homiletics, the art of preaching. Each student gives a homily once a week and receives comments about techniques and content.

His other classes include Christian anthropology, Hinduism, a scripture class dealing with St. Paul's epistles, and a moral theology class dealing with sex in marriage.

While studying at St. John's, he also is receiving credit toward a master of religious studies from University of Detroit.

"All you can do with a master of divinity degree is be a priest. If I decided not to go into the priesthood, the master of religious studies would be more valuable."

A FEW STUDENTS who begin at St. John's decide to drop out, and a few others are sometimes asked to take leaves to reconsider their decisions for the priesthood.

After the morning class, the student body sometimes gathers for a colloquy with the formation team—three priests and a sister who talk on various topics and then divide students into small groups for discussions.

Formation team members are the Rev. Monsignor Clement Kern, Sister Elizabeth Pickens, Fr. Tom Moore and Fr. Ken Untener, rector at St. John's. They help form students spiritually and pastorally to be prepared for

the priesthood. One team member is assigned as a student's contact person and another as his spiritual director. Tom meets his contact person and spiritual director every three weeks.

On Mondays and Thursdays students gather for mass, which the public is welcome to attend. On Tuesdays and Fridays the mass is at 8:30 a.m., on Wednesdays at 4:30 p.m. and Saturdays at 4 p.m. On Sundays seminarians go to other parishes.

The chapel's ornate door is flanked by statues of St. John Vianney, venerated as a model parish priest, and St. Charles Borromeo, an Italian cardinal who led the church to clerical reform.

The arched, stained-glass windows extending down both sides of the tall, narrow sanctuary depict the 12 disciples and the order of the priesthood as they were in the Middle Ages. Most orders in the intricately-pieced panels are no longer used by the Catholic church.

One window shows a future priest having his hair clipped off, another shows a porter ringing a bell to summon people to the celebration of the Eucharist and another shows an exorcist in action.

Two of the orders—now called ministries—still exist in the church: that of the lector, who reads the Bible at mass, and that of the acolyte, who assists at mass.

Under the windows are 14 stations of the cross, Italian carvings beginning with Jesus's being sentenced and given the cross, and ending with His body being cleansed and made ready for the tomb.

THE SEMINARIANS ADDED a casual touch to the chapel's formal atmosphere.

Like Tom, many were in blue jeans and sport shirts. Several sported long hair or fro and beards. Only the few being installed as lectors and acolytes wore coats and ties. Some of their parents were present, along with a group of retired nuns who live on the premises.

As a guitarist strummed and sang, the congregation joined in with the students' harmony echoing through the chapel. At one point the service stopped while the congregation shook hands and exchanged greetings. Then they lined up to receive the bread and wine of holy communion.

Tom explained that most non-Catholics expect a much more formal service, as was the case before church reform when the Vatican II Council brought sweeping changes in the 1960s.

"The Vatican II Council made it

clear there is not a hierarchy in the church. We are all servants—every one. The church is trying to involve lay people now," Tom said.

After the service the seminarians flocked to the dining room, serving their own salad and soup and finding sandwiches on tables set for six. One group discussed the probability of women being ordained to the priesthood.

"It will happen," Tom predicted. "Sometime between 10 and 500 years from now."

He admitted the celibacy requirement is one thing which has caused decreasing numbers in the priesthood, such as evidenced at St. John's which has only 70 students although its facilities could house 200.

"There is tremendous pressure in society for marriage," he said, explaining that he views celibacy as a gift. "The same way a surgeon needs nimble fingers, a priest needs celibacy. It's the gift of his profession."

Most students have another class after lunch, followed by free time until dinner. During this time involvement in outside work is encouraged.

LAST YEAR Tom taught a course called "Church in the Modern World" at St. Edith Catholic School in Livonia.

"It was very rewarding. Young people are very responsive to the call to be witnesses. They are burdened by expectations from their peers and their parents, and they are responsive to the gospel message. An authentic experience of our own humanity is more the exception than the rule today."

This year he visits prisoners at Wayne County Jail. "It's a fascinating ministry. I have had my mind opened to the criminal justice system."

He now agreed with wardens who have said that only 15 per cent of the people in prison belong there, using as an example a 73-year-old man who killed a friend in a feud when they were both drinking heavily. He thinks probation would serve both society and the individual in this case.

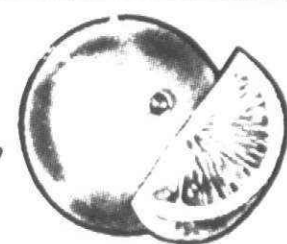
Although seminarians are not required to take their meals on the premises, most are generally there for the 5:45 p.m. dinner, often followed by a 7:30 p.m. class.

Sometimes there's basketball, with competition against the Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit, St. Mary's Seminary in Orchard Lake or a Baptist church team in Ann Arbor.

Much studying must be worked into the busy days, and much time spent in the library which has 4,400 volumes and stocks 400 current periodicals.

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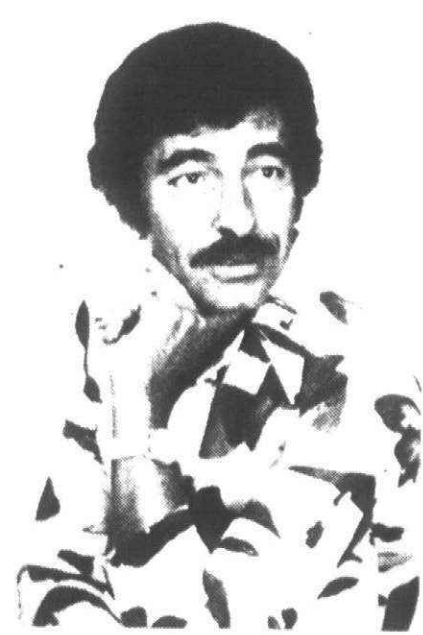
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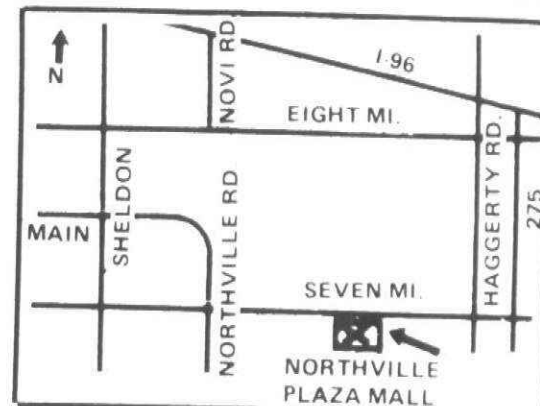
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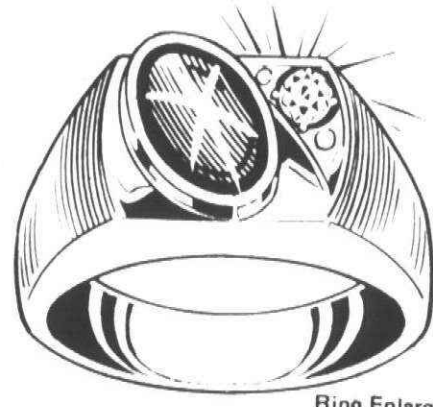
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County service cut back Dec. 1

"People will have to get used to slower services—from the marriage license counter to park maintenance along Edward Hines Drive," said Jarrette Simmons (D-Detroit), chairwoman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

The slower services will be the result of another in a series of crisis budgets which will go into effect Dec. 1.

The \$349 million budget adopted last month calls for laying off 121 county employees outside the courts, including 24 assistant prosecutors, plus the

elimination of more than 100 vacant non-court jobs.

IN AN EFFORT to stave off the cuts, Mrs. Simmons and other commissioners have been trying to coax more state funds from Lansing. The Wayne County contingent is asking that the state increase funding for programs which it has mandated.

"The increasing burden of state-ordered costs in the face of stringent revenue limits has broken the county's financial back," Mrs. Simmons said.

"The cost of the court system alone

has doubled in the last five years. The burden of protecting the public safety in the nation's third largest county requires a greater degree of state participation," she said.

The county is asking the state to pick up the tab for \$8 million for the probation departments in the Circuit Court and Records Court and \$9 million to cover the costs of hospital care for medically-indigent adults.

The county is also trying to collect \$4.2 million from the state for services last year at the Wayne County Psychiatric Hospital.

County officials contend that if the state does not come across with more than \$20 million, they will have to go

ahead with the planned layoffs beginning Dec. 1.

THE NEW budget is about \$26 million less than last year's. It also contains \$15 million in cutbacks. The itemized cuts include:

- A \$1 million cut in Wayne County General Hospital's budget.
- \$4.3 million cut from the operations of the courts and related services.
- More than \$908,000 to be cut from the sheriff's budget. The commissioners, however, voted to continue funding of the township road patrol and the sheriff's helicopter patrol.

All area residents are invited to the benefit. Money raised by the admission donation of \$1, plus from the sale

of refreshments, will go towards covering the cost of the special Christmas party.

The party was originally planned to reach children at Northville whose conditions prohibited them from ever leaving that facility. Because of that, these children always missed out on the Christmas trips to Garden City's VFW post.

The project, however, was extended this year to include children at the Southgate mental health facility at the suggestion of the administrative staff of Northville.

Music by Disco Danny will range from the 1930s to the present day sound. There will be a cash bar for adults, soft drinks for children and light dinners served. Prizes available to those attending will include CB radios, airplane rides and other donations from local merchants.

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Beauty greets visitors

If there is a country with more beautiful and friendly people than you find in New Zealand, Lou LaRiche, an auto dealer in Plymouth, would like to know where it is.

LaRiche and his wife, Gail, have just returned from a 10-day stay in the South Pacific Islands, and he tells you that mere words can't do justice to what they saw and how they were treated no matter where they went.

The LaRiches were members of a group of Chevrolet dealers from all parts of America who won sales contests. More than 100 of them, along with their wives, made the trip in a 747 for what LaRiche called "the time of our lives."

TAKING OFF FROM Metro airport, the party landed in San Francisco and then flew to Hawaii and to New Zealand.

"When we were told that we were flying over New Zealand and about to land," LaRiche explained, "I looked down and the country looked like on big golf course. It was just beautiful."

"But that was as nothing compared to the friendliness of the people after we landed. No one could have treated us better, from the employees in the hotels to the caretakers in the museums or even the casual folks we met along the way."

One of the things that struck them rather funny was the fact that there are three million people there and 63 million sheep.

He smiles when he tells you that he never knew that there were so many kinds of sheep. "I thought there were just two—male and female—but we learned over there that there are 16 varieties, and the wool is one of the country's greatest commodities. It was a treat to see one of the sheep ranchers shear one of the larger sheep in just 30 seconds," LaRiche said.

Another thing that left its imprint is that the residents seemed so eager to talk and learn about the United States.

"Everywhere we went we were asked about America, and many of the people we spoke with would like to come to America but can't afford it," LaRiche said.

According to what the visiting dealers were told, the man who earns \$125 a week in New Zealand is making big money.

The low wages are evident in the shopping area, where milk is eight cents a pint, butter 34 cents a pound and where a loaf of bread weighing one and one half pounds sells for 20 cents.

"But they are happy with it all," LaRiche said.

ANOTHER THING the American group noticed was that the New Zealanders observe the five-day work week. The stores are closed on Saturdays and Sundays. The unemployment rate is only two per cent.

One of the beauty spots they visited was the Auckland Museum, which was fascinating because it portrayed the culture of the Maoris—the early settlers of the country. Another fascinating trip was to a winery.

LaRiche and his group learned that wine making is an infant industry in New Zealand. For years the residents drank only beer, but now, with the raising of grapes, the wineries are changing the old-time custom.

At Hellsville the group was treated to an outside barbecue by the Lions Club and later were guests at a rugby game, and then at a series of lawn bowling matches.

After you are there a while, LaRiche said, you realize that you are off by yourself, as New Zealand is 1,900 miles from Australia, and because you never are more than 110 miles from the ocean.

With all the beauty and the friendliness, LaRiche confides that he would not want to live there.

"Their laws are different and, because of the small population, there is not much chance of doing business on a big scale."

"But for beauty and the friendliness of the people, the place cannot be beat."

SEMTA's Park-and-ride blooms in western suburbs

It started strong, and it should get better as the word goes around.

It's the new park-and-ride express bus service from Farmington, Livonia and Redford Township to downtown Detroit.

"All our park-and-ride business was up 70 per cent last year," said John Saunders, manager of marketing for the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

"The Plymouth-Livonia run started last year with four buses, and we're up to six. The whole corridor is a very good one," Saunders said.

THE NEW RUN actually began Oct. 30, but it was formally dedicated in ceremonies Wednesday morning.

Among officials on hand were to be Mayors Richard L. Tupper of Farmington, Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills and Edward H. McNamara of Livonia (who doubles as SEMTA board chairman); state Rep. Wilbur V. Brotherton (R-Farmington), a supporter of SEMTA funding bills; and SEMTA General Manager Larry E. Salci.

The new service features three round-trip buses from the suburbs to the Renaissance Center on the Detroit riverfront each weekday.

Saunders said riders work for Ford Motor Co. in Ren Cen, for Michigan Bell Telephone Co. at Michigan and Cass and "generally sprinkled around the downtown."

"There are lots of younger riders—in the 21-35 age group. There are stock brokers, computer programmers, secretaries and people in advertising," the marketing man said.

THE IDEA for the run—and all SEMTA runs—comes from "inquiries," Saunders said.

They may just be calls from the public. They may come from local public officials who get calls from their constituents. SEMTA is in close touch with personnel managers of large companies, he added.

In the first week, Saunders said, ridership on the new run grew from 52 on Monday, Oct. 30, to 116 by Thursday, Nov. 3, the last day for which figures were immediately available.

The run begins at the American Legion hall on Grand River at Lakeway, just east of downtown Farmington. Ten minutes later, it stops at Livonia Mall. Seven Mile at Middlebelt. In another 10 minutes, it stops at Forest City, Middlebelt at Schoolcraft. And in five minutes, it's at the Jeffries Freeway (I-96) and Seminole in Redford Township.

From there, it's 28 minutes to the corner of Michigan and Cass, the first downtown Detroit stop. Last stop is RenCen.

Runs leave Farmington in the morning at 6:40, 7 and 7:20. They leave RenCen in the evening at 4:40, 4:55 and 5:15.

Price from Farmington is 95 cents one way.

"You can also buy a Semta card for a month for \$28.50," said Saunders. "You can take any route, any day of the week with that."

The buses are the new SEMTA Advanced Design RTS vehicles, worth about \$110,000 each.

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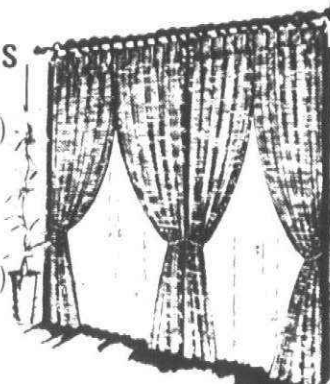

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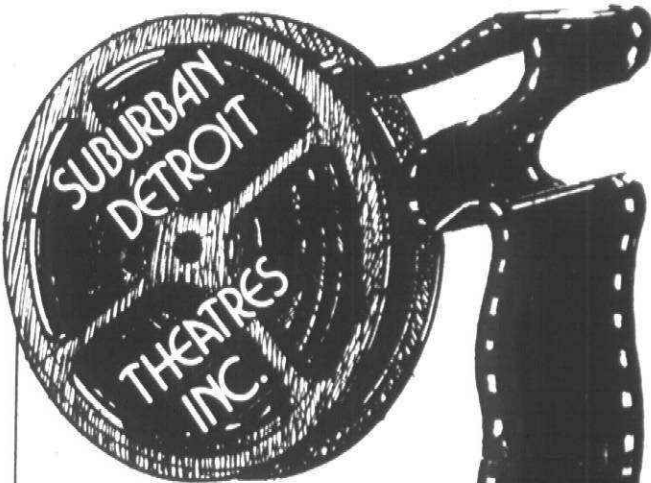

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Vienna in review

One of the characteristics of Detroit's Schubert/Vienna Festival has been the variety of concerts, and composers represented.

It hasn't been just Schubert, just symphony, just solo or just chamber music.

To illustrate, let's look at three of last week's concerts. On Monday, the Marlborough Trio—Charles Libove, violin; Mitchell Andrews, piano; and Charles McCracken, cello—played Schubert's E Flat and B Flat piano trios.

Tuesday found us in Ford Auditorium listening to three types of pieces—straight orchestra, songs with orchestra, and the Berg Violin Concerto, a 1935 composition played by Itzhak Perlman. Thursday, back in Orchestra Hall, pianist Murray Perahia performed another all-Schubert program.

THE MARLBOROUGH Trio concert was such a fine performance that to "review" it really could best be accomplished by saying, "I'm sorry you weren't there." Since the audience was absolutely soundless for the performance's hour and 50 minutes, the following musical refinements could be heard.

Beginning the development section of the first movement of the E Flat Trio, there is a long crescendo. It begins "triple piano," which in Orchestra Hall means triple piano—as quiet as you can get.

Through the strings' arpeggios could be heard the piano, Mitchell Andrews articulating melodic material with the beautiful clarity his playing showed all evening. His Schubert "touch" indeed, was sublime, another example being

the repeated notes, and octaves, of the B Flat Trio's Rondo.

He produced a lush effect seemingly effortlessly in passages of great difficulty. At another spot, in the last movement of the E Flat Trio, he played some molten scales that never dominated the strings.

String playing by Libove and McCracken, too, showed nobility and finesse, as in contrasts between tenderness and sforzando, and between brave unison passages and singing of solo lines such as the cello passage in the B Flat Trio's Rondo.

The tender four-note theme of this trio's Andante movement—simplicity itself—contained 100 million sweet sounds to give the most ardent Schubert lover a wintersworth of memory.

Maestro Dorati himself attended this concert, taking the time from his whirlwind of concerts, rehearsals and appearances to enjoy the gemutlichkeit of Orchestra Hall.

Dorati's conducting of Schubert, Scherztsik, Wolf, Schoenberg, Webern and Berg in Ford Auditorium the following night likewise was of the best quality. The program, however, wasn't of such sustained beauty. The purely orchestral works, such as Schubert's Rosamunde Overture and D Minor Minuet, came off rather as filler pieces.

They were restrained, even elegant, but relatively uninteresting compared to the solo-featured works of the evening. These were led by Schubert and Wolf, and the Dove's song from Schoenberg's "Gurrelieder," all sung by contralto Maureen Forrester, as well as the Berg Violin Concerto.

IN MASTERFUL PROGRAMMING, Dorati included not only Romantic

songs, with their beautiful melodies, but also to quote the program notes, "The apotheosis of all Romantic elements . . . all in the best Wagnerian tradition" in the form of the song from "Gurrelieder," and finally a Schubert work which is the antithesis of melody because it uses the 12 tone system—the Berg concerto.

All of this in one night was something like a music history class, and it made an intelligent reprieve, if that was needed, from pure Schubert. Only Elisabeth Soderstrom's lieder recital and last Sunday's "Concert Eleven" vaired, also, from all-Schubert evenings.

Miss Forrester's sensitive contralto voice and heart-felt interpretations lent dignity to "Du bist die Ruh'" and passion to "Tauben von Gurre." However, Ford Auditorium's acoustics swallowed the sorrow and passion of a lady whose refrain is "I flew far, I sought / And I found heavy sorrow." The interpretation as a whole was rather more sedate than magic.

Alban Berg's violin concerto combines the most gothic sort of programmatic romanticism—"The death of a beautiful maiden," as Edgar Allen Poe would say—with the most abstract of all music composition types, the dodecaphonic system. This is taking all 12 notes in a chromatic scale, setting them down in what sounds like any old accidental order, and using the resulting pattern in various ways.

ITZHAK PERLMAN DID MORE than play this incredibly complex work—he communicated it. With the timing, technique and tone that have made him famous, he gave a stunning reading of one of the world's most difficult violin works.

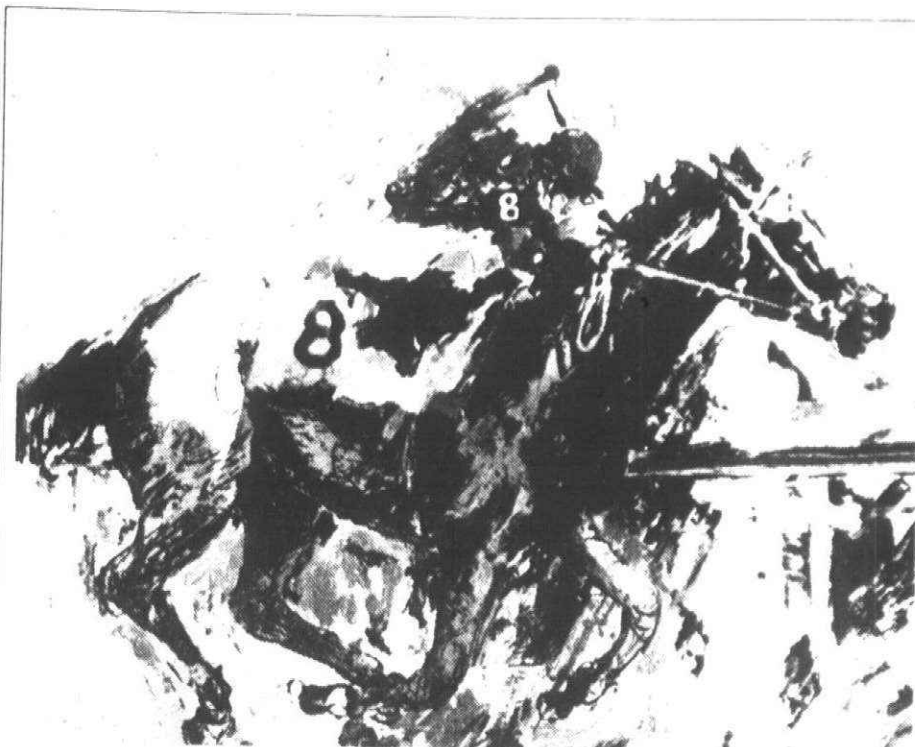
In some beautiful solo playing of his own, concertmaster Gordon Staples complemented the virtuosity of the formidable Perlman. It was a powerful and moving performance with Dorati and the rest of the orchestra, too, at their best.

In orchestra Hall Thursday, pianist Murray Perahia played four Schubert impromptus and the A Major Sonata. Perahia is an irrefutable performer. With a noble profile, a shock of black hair and a mystical air about him, he comes on as a highly individualistic player, much as Liszt was said to have been.

Not as fiery as Liszt, who regularly caused ladies to swoon (whoever thought that started with Elvis?), Perahia is, however, essentially a passionate musician, complete with elaborate gestures at the end of phrases and a kind of concentration that spells immersion, a "gestalt" approach, and romanticism. His playing, however, was controlled, disciplined and beautifully crafted.

OF THE IMPROMPTUS, the G Flat Major was perhaps the weakest, coming across without too much flexibility in the melodic line. This is supposed to float dreamily out over shimmering arpeggio accompaniment. But when Perahia came to the A Flat Impromptu, a piece played by most pianists, the melody soared, the inner section rang and the whole piece conveyed Schubert at his most ravishing.

Something happens in Orchestra Hall where a sensitive performer can hear clearly the results of his musical intentions. Listening to the crystalline clarity of his own sounds, he surpasses himself. It's a kind of magic, given the humdrum acoustics of many modern halls, and it happened in this recital.

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Plymouth Symphony hosts cellist Sunday for Dvorak, Schubert

The unabashed romanticism of the 19th century will dominate the program of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra at 4 p.m. Sunday in the auditorium of Plymouth-Salem High School, Joy west of Canton Center roads.

The second concert of the season will feature cellist Ross Harbaugh in one of the major solo works for the baritone of the string section—Antonin Dvorak's Concerto in B minor for Cello and Orchestra.

Franz Schubert's Symphony No. 5 and Arnold Bax's "The Garden of Fand" will open the program.

IN STATURE, the Dvorak concerto is to the cello what Tchaikovsky's First Concerto is to the piano and Mendelssohn's is to the violin. It's an epic work for an instrument of great sonority and dizzying tonal range.

While Dvorak was coached and encouraged by Johannes Brahms, the inspiration for the cello concerto came from a cellist best known to us today as composer of light opera—Victor Herbert. He and Dvorak were New York neighbors when the concerto was composed in 1895.

"Ross Harbaugh has a marvelous tone," said Plymouth Conductor Wayne Dunlap. "He was popular here last year when the New World String Quartet played with the symphony and a recital in Geneva United Presbyterian Church."

A native of Minnesota, Harbaugh has been soloist with the orchestras of Toledo, Atlanta and Cincinnati, among others. He is a graduate of the Juilliard School of Music and studied at the Paris Conservatory.

The New World quartet, of which he is still a member, has recorded "Music of American Composers Who Were Not Born Here," Dunlap reported.

SCHUBERT WAS the original hippie," said Dunlap of the prolific but short-lived composer, the 150th anniversary of whose death is being observed this year.

Bax's work, "The Garden of Fand," refers to the sea. The story is about the Gaelic legendary hero Cuchulain, the Irish equivalent of King Arthur or Paul Bunyan. Bax's musical work is a tone poem in impressionistic style.

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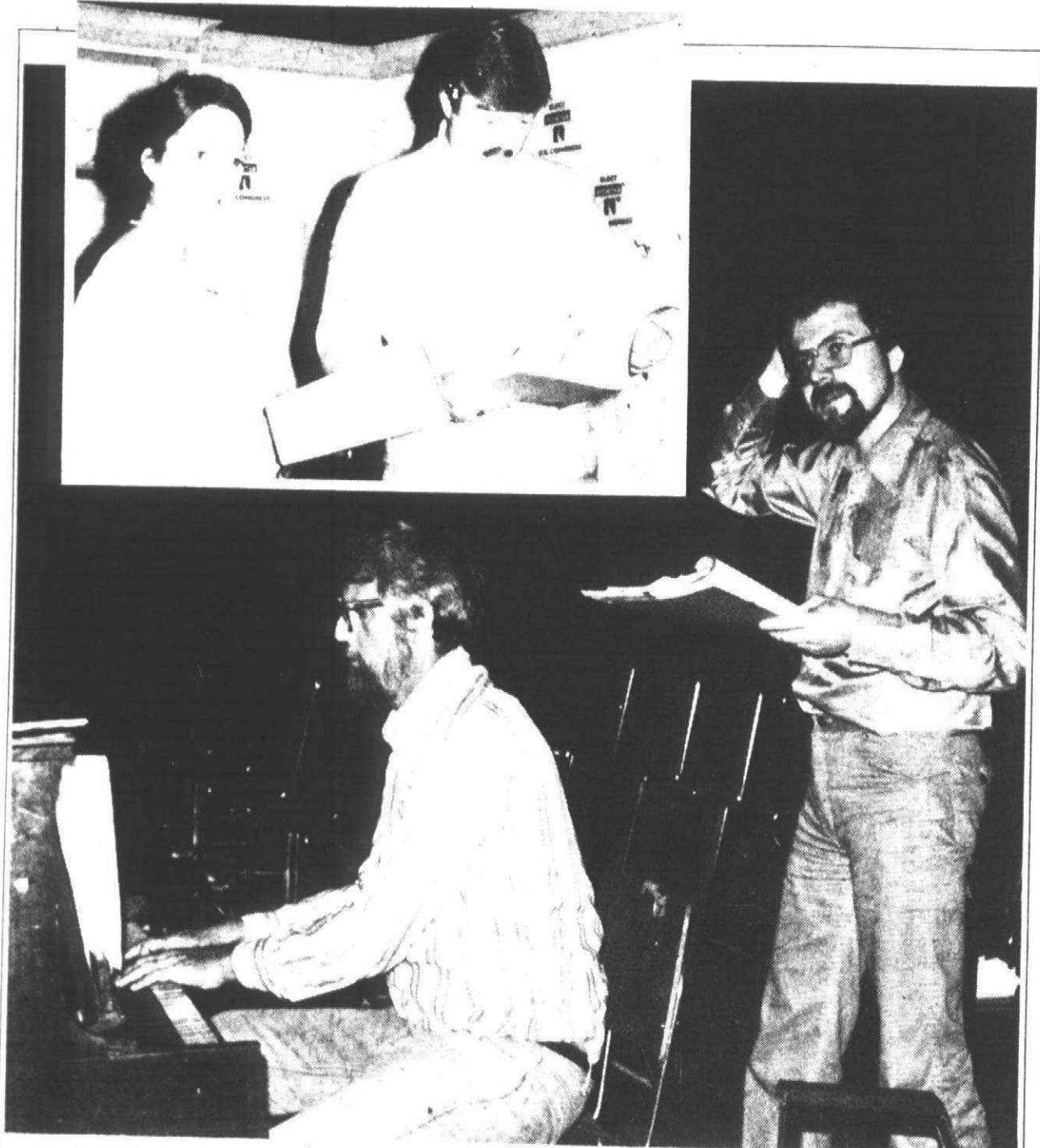

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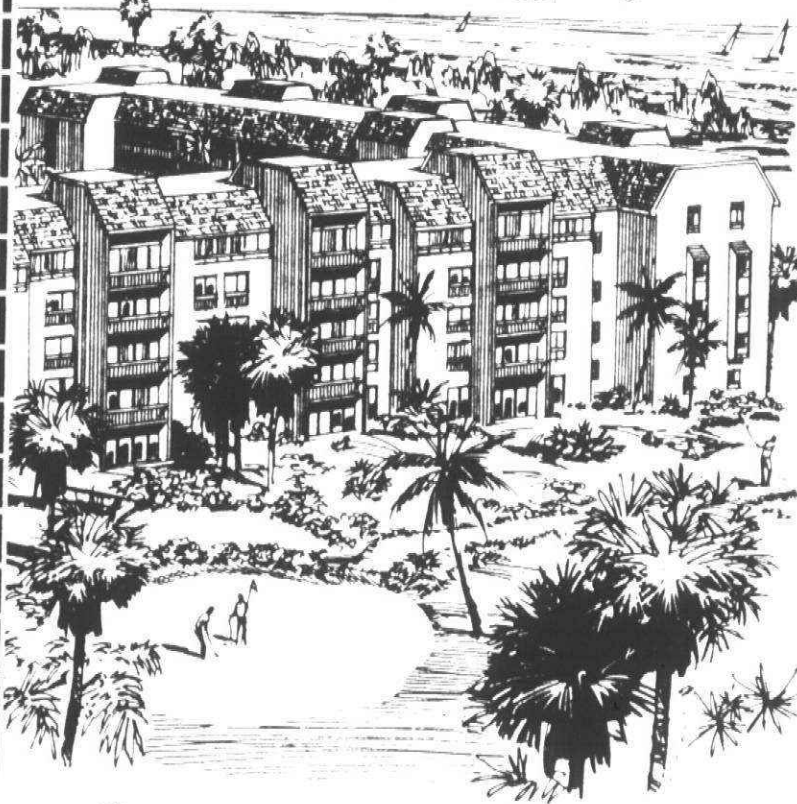

Joe Louis's money lengthen

When the celebrities of stage, screen and the boxing world gathered in Las Vegas the other evening to pay an emotional tribute to Joe Louis, they innocently focused attention to the oft asked question:

"What became of Joe Louis's fortune?" "Who stole his money?"

Ever since the Brown Bomber, a product of Paradise Valley on Detroit's lower east side, was felled by illness some years ago and wound up an almost helpless cripple in a wheel chair in Las Vegas, these questions have been asked.

Unfortunately, the people who are loudest in asking the questions know little of the boxing game, and how the big purses are divided. All they know is that the champion was paid an enormous sum (to them, at least) and they wonder just how he could spend it.

WELL, TO SET the record straight, the champion, no matter who he happens to be, does not get to keep the entire purse. It has to be divided with his managers, and this often poses a question.

In many cases, the managers take one-third of the purse and make the fighter pay all expenses, including the heavily populated training camp, from his share. This often runs into the thousands of dollars.

In the Louis camp, things were run on a different plan. Under the guidance of John Roxborough, who befriended Louis from his amateur days, the purse was split in what he called a more equitable fashion.

It was agreed by all concerned that the Louis camp should run like a corporation. In this policy, all expenses were paid out of the original purse. It was Roxborough's belief that the manager was equally responsible for the debt.

NOW, IF YOU look at the records, Louis's total purses for all of his title defenses amounted to less than \$5 million over the 12 years he was champion. So, in reality, he wasn't paid a

"fortune" compared to what the champions and challengers get today.

Of that \$5 million, it is reasonable to suppose that the expenses ran close to, if not more than, \$1 million. Joe never ran a cheap training camp. It was always of the best, with a private chef, a bodyguard, a trainer, a doctor and a lawyer, aside from his sparring partners.

The remaining \$4 million was split, which meant that Joe was given \$2 million over a 14 year period. This is an average of little more than \$140,000 a year.

Quite a sum, but it must be remembered that Joe took good care of his family. First he paid back all the welfare money his mother received. He bought her a home.

His sister wanted an education and thought a trip around the world would do it. So Joe sent her on the trip. He set up another in a high class beauty shop in Paradise Valley. And he bought his brothers a chicken farm in Wyandotte, and he paid income tax into many thousands of dollars.

ALWAYS A FREE spender, he also purchased a row of apartment houses in Chicago which he gave to his wife, Marva, in settlement of their divorce. And he got to be a gambler on the golf course, playing for as much as \$100 a hole with some of the same celebrities who honored him the other evening.

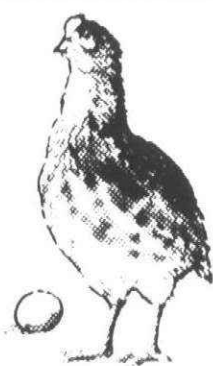

Chrusial operates out of his home at 19345 Brentwood, Livonia. Although canned food and new toys donations are still coming in, he admits the level of help isn't what it was three or more years ago.

In the early 1970s, the committee met goals of 3,000 cans of food. Things have been down since then.

Yet some work gets done. A week ago, a truck from the St. Catherine mission near the upper peninsula village of L'Anse picked up 685 toys and

seven boxes of clothing from Chrusial's collection. Rev. Elmer Stoffel is the priest in charge there.

THE WESTERN Wayne Indian Affairs Committee has scheduled two trips northward next month for which it is collecting new toys, new clothing and canned food.

On Dec. 2, it will visit the Woodland Indians of the tri-county area around Muskegon. A kids Christmas party is scheduled for that Saturday, and a senior citizens party for Sunday.

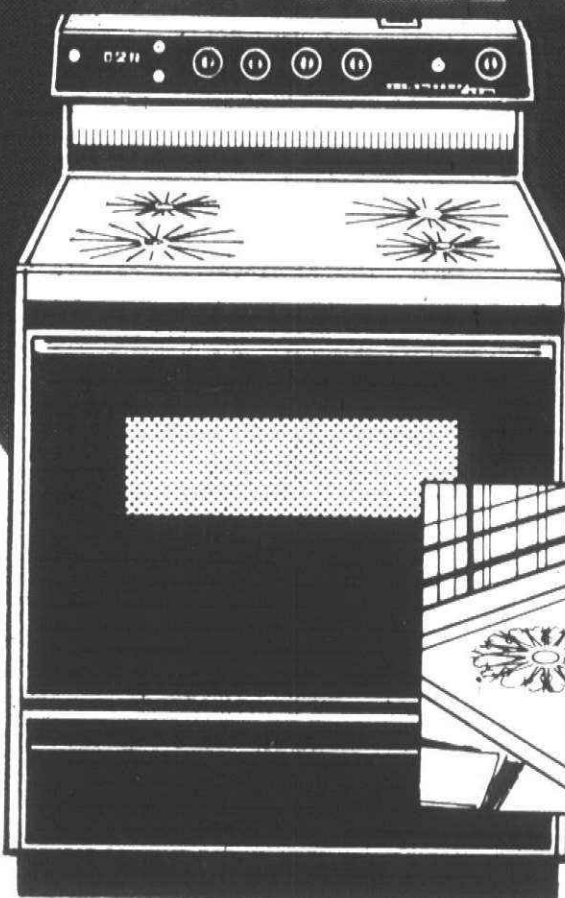
"We could use gifts for the elderly—lap covers, lamps, cribbage boards, playing cards and electrical kitchen utensils," said Chrusial.

Deadline for gifts for that trip is Nov. 30.

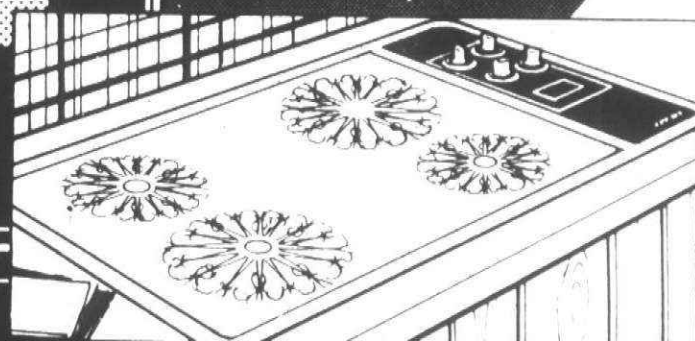
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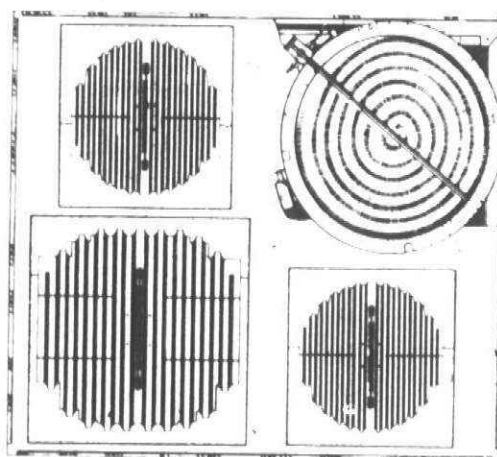

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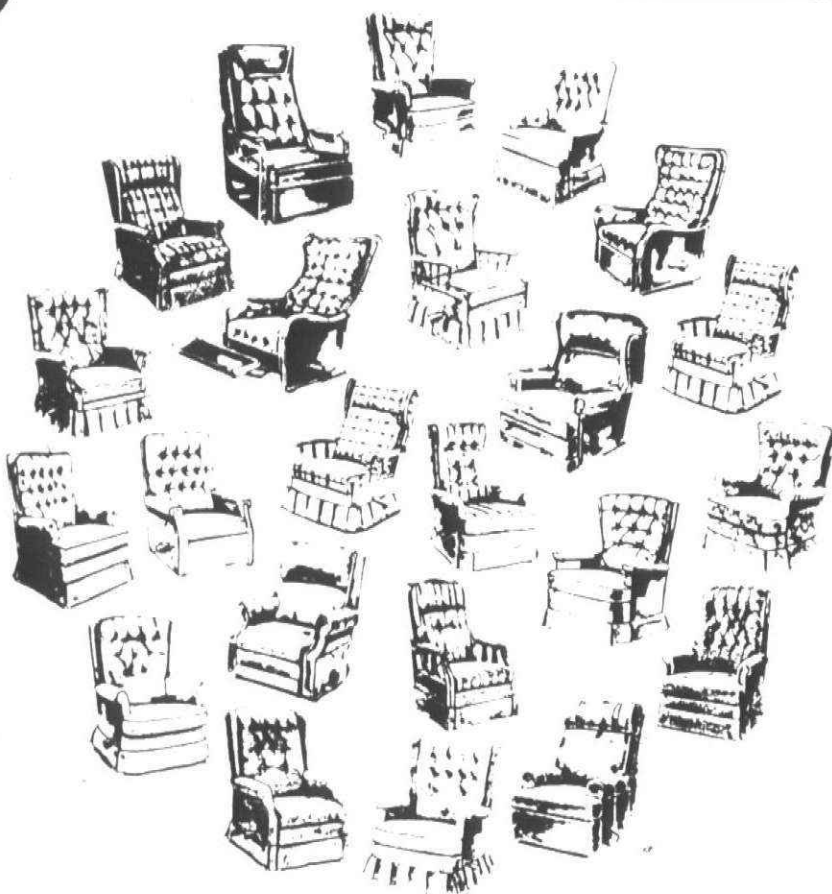

Master plan is a priority

The campaign hoopla and election antics are over for another year.

Next week, victorious candidates will be taking their places as Canton Township's elected officials.

They've had a week to sit back and relax from the frantic pace they've been maintaining. Now it's time to take stock and plan for the future.

We hope that all those campaign promises are kept. Some of those promises won't be easy to fulfill.

The defeat of the farmland preservation tax proposal makes it necessary for new officials to come up with ways to keep Canton's farmland without having the money to buy development rights. Judging from the initial question asking residents whether farmland should be preserved, and the close outcome of the most recent request for millage (in a year of the taxpayer revolt), we would conclude people want that land preserved.

Officials will have to move quickly, ahead of the developers, to keep the agricultural district.

Perhaps they will ask for a lower amount of millage in a special election, or explore the possibility of using zoning restraints.

Before they can do any of these things, our new officials must act on a master plan for Canton that will be strictly adhered to.

WITHOUT something as basic as a master plan, Canton will be torn apart by the colliding self-interests of farmers, developers, residents and businesses.

Without a master plan, the township board is almost forced into acting on various zoning questions by whim rather than planning.

But a master plan is only as good as the people who enforce it. If our new officials develop a plan, perhaps based on the one developed during Robert Greenstein's term as supervisor, they must be willing to follow it.

There was nothing wrong with the original master plan; but no one bothered to follow it.

Township board members are going to have to make a commitment when the time comes to consider a new master plan for Canton.

These plans cost money—money that goes down the drain if the results of the plan are blithely ignored.

CANTON CITIZENS have always been vocal about the things they want for their community. They elected the new township officers to get what they want.

They want a decent place to live that still has a few open spaces. They want an aesthetically pleasing community with an atmosphere conducive to raising families.

They want places to shop, but not too many and not too ugly; and they want places to work—but once again, not ugly ones.

It's up to the new elected officials to try to get these things.

At the beginning of this decade, the Christmas shopping message began the day after Halloween.

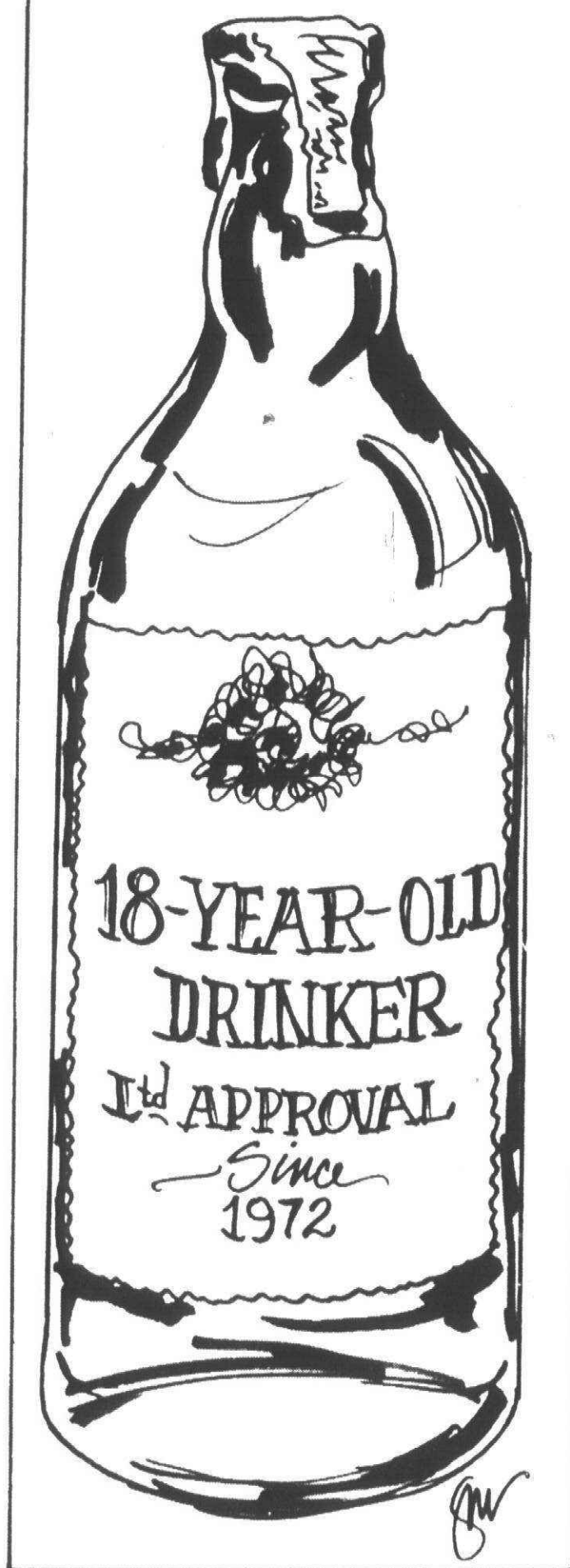
This year we heard our first Christmas message right after Labor Day.

Truck stops make issue of fuel tax hike

As if we hadn't had enough of taxpayer petitions, another one is brewing. This time it concerns the two cents a gallon hike in motor fuel and hike in license fees recently enacted by our heroes in the Michigan Legislature.

State Sens. John Welborn (R-Kalamazoo) and Harry DeMaso (R-Battle Creek) were opposed to the increase. Their goal is to get enough petition signatures by the end of the year and put the questions on the 1980 ballot.

Welborn is an "aginner." In Gerald Ford's home state, Welborn was 1976 chairman for Ronald Reagan. DeMaso is different. He's to the right of center but non-doctrinaire, a problem solver and an expert on the nuts and bolts of taxation.

So we shouldn't write off their petition drive as a sorehead thing.

BOTH SENATORS come from the south-central part of the state. In their districts are stations that sell fuel to truckers.

As I listened to the floor debate in the senate, it was the diesel fuel tax more than the overall tax increase that was bothering some senators.

They argued that Michigan would lose 30 to 40 per cent of its diesel fuel tax revenue, along with a lot of truck stop business, if the diesel fuel hike were put through.

The situation is that neighboring states collect seven to eight cents a gallon tax on diesel fuel. If Michigan raises its diesel tax to nine cents, truckers will gas up across the border. With their large tanks, they will be able to make deliveries in almost any part of the state and return across the border before they have to refuel.

It's obvious political nonsense to raise the gasoline tax two cents a gallon and not the diesel fuel tax. Trucks, as well as autos, use the roads, too. We must either raise all fuel taxes, as the majority

in the legislature voted to do, or none, as Welborn and DeMaso propose.

THE MUCH-HERALDED "tax revolt" turned out to be less of a concern in Michigan Nov. 7 than the politicians—including Richard Headlee and Robert Tisch—had supposed.

Headlee's pitch was based on a distorted set of figures, and his tax limitation plan barely passed although polls had showed it leading. Tisch's version of California's Proposition 13 went bust. So did the voucher plan, which contained a property tax cut.

And incumbent legislators of both parties tended to win by bigger margins than ever. With the

notable exception of Sen. Robert Griffin, Michiganders liked their local lawmakers pretty much the way they are.

It has been nine years since Michigan has seen a statewide increase in passenger and commercial vehicle registration fees and five years since any increase in fuel taxes. The notion that we're being taxed to death for roads is simply untrue.

AND YET we bump up against the reality that Michigan businesses will lose income and the state will lose tax revenue if truckers fill up across the border. Michigan cannot afford to disregard competition.

The fault in our thinking is the concept of the "user" tax—that taxes on automotive products should support roads, taxes on hunters should purchase hunting lands, taxes on sales and property should support schools.

Michigan's transportation system—roads, rails, buses, airports, ports and the rest—needs more revenue. I have stronger and stronger doubts about levying specific taxes for that fund. The personal income and single business taxes should have been the logical alternative.

When the celebrities of stage, screen and the boxing world gathered in Las Vegas the other evening to pay an emotional tribute to Joe Louis, they innocently focused attention to the oft asked question:

"What became of Joe Louis's fortune?" "Who stole his money?"

Ever since the Brown Bomber, a product of Paradise Valley on Detroit's lower east side, was felled by illness some years ago and wound up an almost helpless cripple in a wheel chair in Las Vegas, these questions have been asked.

Unfortunately, the people who are loudest in asking the questions know little of the boxing game, and how the big purses are divided. All they know is that the champion was paid an enormous sum (to them, at least) and they wonder just how he could spend it.

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Step taken to fill Whitman plant

Plymouth Township trustees took the first step Tuesday towards a tax break for industrial newcomer Otto Durr, Inc.

The board, in a 4-2 decision, created an industrial district for the vacant Whitman Barnes property on Plymouth Road, east of Haggerty. Durr, now located in Livonia, plans to purchase the property for nearly \$1 1/2 million.

Trustees Maurice Breen and Lee Fidge opposed the creation of the industrial district, which the company requested under the state industrial development laws.

The manufacturing company has received permission from Livonia to relocate in the township under state requirements for eligibility in the development program.

The firm plans to remodel the building with about \$1.4 million borrowed from the state and financed with the sale of tax-free bonds. The state's industrial program is designed to encourage business and industry to locate or remain in Michigan.

OTTO DURR, INC. is seeking a 50 per cent tax break from the township on the proposed remodeling of the building. Without the tax break, the firm would pay taxes on approximately one-half the value of the nearly \$1.5 million remodeling.

Under the industrial development district, Durr will ask for a 50 per cent reduction in taxes on the new construction of the property for a 12-year period.

The property tax paid on the assessed value of the property is maintained and increased according to assessed valuation.

Supervisor Thomas Notebaert explained that future tax estimates for the property include about \$39,000 in property tax on the assessed value of \$735,000, and about \$18,508 in taxes on the assessed value of the new construction at half of its market value of \$700,000.

Total estimated revenues for 1979 would be about \$73,379, about six per cent of which would accrue to the township. The Plymouth-Canton Community School District receives the

bulk of property tax paid on the property.

ALTHOUGH confirming that the state's program was good for Lansing, Breen failed to see the benefits for the township.

"For the local community, I don't think it does you any good," he said, adding that there's no promise that about 60 additional employees over the next two years will be Plymouth Township residents.

"The dollars you're getting out of this would not support an increased load on the schools or cover the services provided by the community."

Ben Roberts, of the Office of Economic Development in Michigan, explained that the employment assets have a ripple effect in the community and attempted to allay fears that a large number of firms would seek the industrial development tax breaks.

Under the law, industrial districts cannot exceed five per cent of the total tax base in a community, he explained.

IN A LETTER to the township, Otto

Durr president James Townley promoted the company's request, explaining that the relocation would help to increase employment, consumer spending and tax revenue in the township.

"As citizens of the community, Otto Durr, Inc. would be sponsoring and supporting community functions," Townley wrote.

Occupation of the vacant property would improve the appearance of the building as well as restrict vandalism, he said.

Proposed renovations include landscaping, exterior walls, stone work, painting and roof repair, while interior work will encompass repair of floors, ceilings, walls and lighting, he added.

In 1977, property taxes of \$92,755 and personal property taxes of \$3,095 were paid on the property assessed at \$1,450,000, approximately half of the market value.

In 1978, the assessed valuation was reduced for one year by the Board of Review to about \$800,000, which reduced property taxes to about \$42,000.

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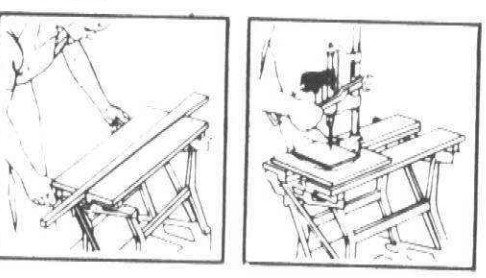
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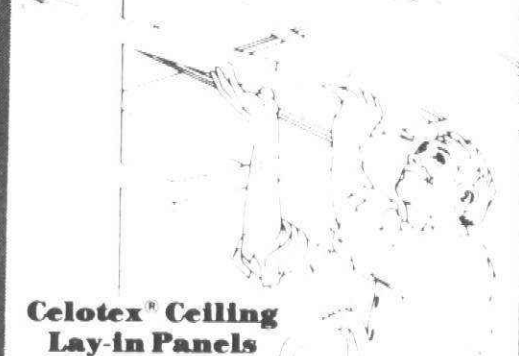

"I would have waited all night to see them," said Salvatore. He had been a member of the 163d Infantry from Montana.

THE VISIT TO the Mayflower had been arranged by Bill Rabe of Lake Superior State College in the Soo. He had written to Kirk Lorenz, manager of the hotel, that on their return, they would need some good old-fashioned American hospitality. He said he recalled the times he and his family had stopped at the Mayflower and Plymouth was added as the last stop on the journey.

The Plymouth Rotary Club quickly decided to arrange a dinner for the veterans and their party. The whole town wanted some part in welcoming the Soo veterans.

The city of Sault Ste. Marie had raised \$30,000 to send the group to Europe. In addition to the bandsmen, six of the members' wives went along, as well as a physician, two persons to handle the band equipment, and 22 others who heard about the trip and decided to go along.

They left Detroit Nov. 5 and spent three days in England, where they were interviewed on BBC radio and several television networks and by all of England's major newspapers.

Wearing their olive-drab World War I uniforms, they had a champagne breakfast aboard a naval cruiser on the Thames River, toured London by bus and visited retired British veterans in the Royal Chelsea Hospital.

THEY CROSSED the English Channel at 65 m.p.h. in a Hovercraft and continued by bus to Armentieres. They watched the Armistice Day parade down the Champs Elysees on the same reviewing stand as French President Valery Giscard d'Estaing.

They visited locations and scenes of great battles—Chateau-Thierry, and Belleau Wood.

"It was out of this world," said Asa Brabant, 83, who played taps on his bugle at the tomb of the unknown soldier in Armentieres.

"It's different now. But as we drove

along those French roads, I remembered all the names of towns as we came to them. They were still there, the same towns I had gone through in a convoy more than 60 years ago. It was just like being in the Army again, it was 'fall in, fall out.'"

Asa's wife, Esther, had been unable to go with him because of arthritis. But she and their son, Paul, and his wife met him at the airport. They were going to Utica to see their grandchildren before heading north for the Soo.

"It was a wonderful trip, but I'm very tired," admitted Anthony Settember, another member of the Soo band.

Jack Grego, 80, a drummer with the band, asked, "Did you know we visited my brother's grave? I didn't get home until July 1919 and I had been at the cemetery—it was just wooden crosses then—but I didn't know then that he was buried there. I didn't know he was dead until I got home."

The Soo bandsmen interrupted their dinner at the Mayflower to give a brief rendition of "Mademoiselle from Armentieres," but soon headed for bed.

"It's three o'clock in the morning in the time we're used to," explained Julia Settember. "It's been a long day."

THE SOO VETS who made the trip were: LaCombe, 82; Louis Menard, 81; Settember, 83; John J. Wilson, 83; Jack Grego, 80; Brabant, 83; Frank Lee, 82; James Callon, 79; Frank Miller, 87; Sante Mirabelli, 86; and Orval Dietz, 82.

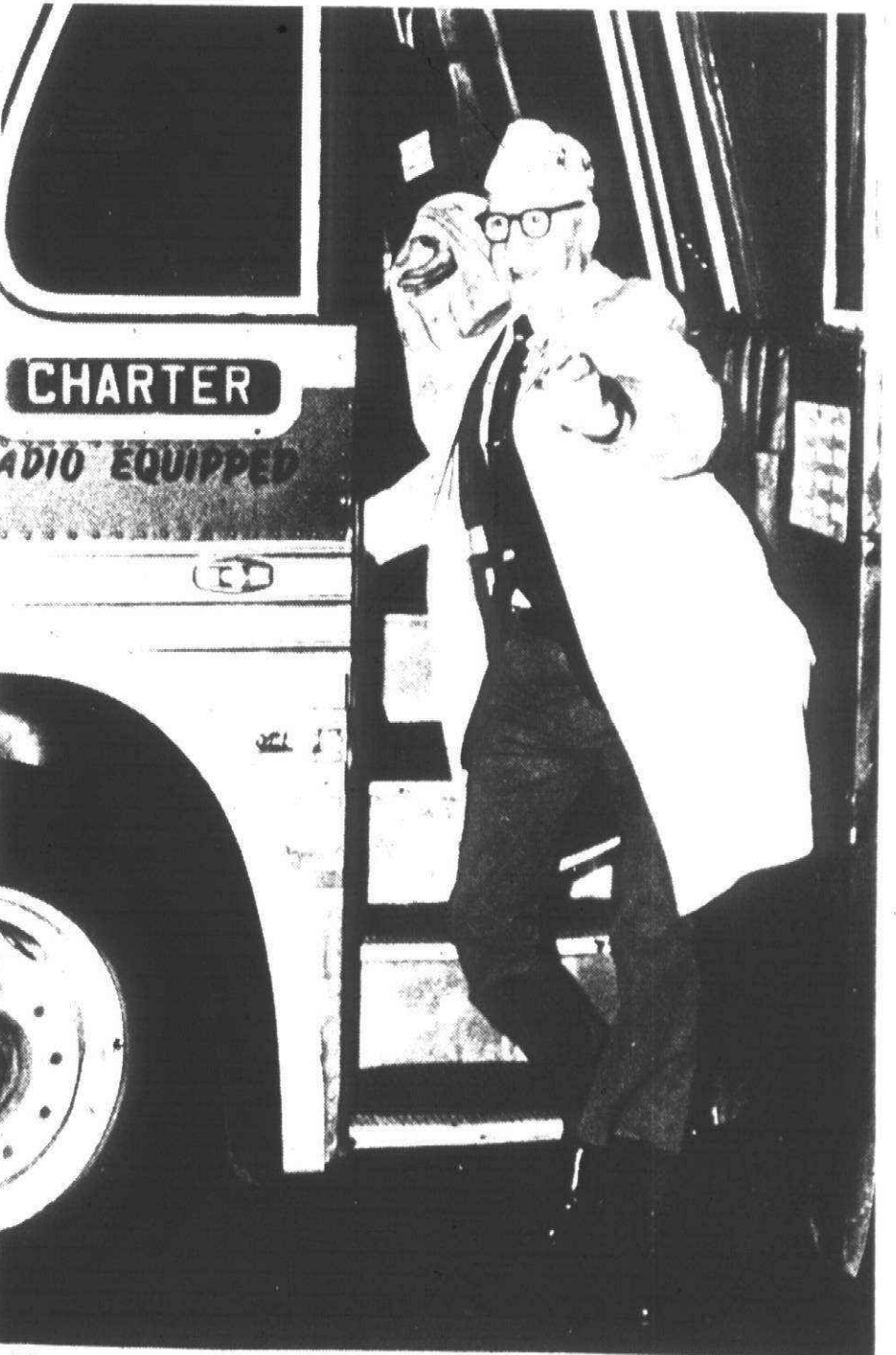

These recipes for a New England

Thanksgiving dinner are taken from a letter written in 1779 by Juliana Smith to her Dear Cousin Betsey.

ROAST GOOSE, WITH POTATO STUFFING

2 cups hot mashed potatoes
1 1/2 cups bread crumbs
1 medium onion, finely chopped
2 eggs, lightly beaten
1 1/2 tps. salt
1 tsp. sage
1/2 cup chopped celery leaves
1/4 cup chopped parsley

Combine mashed potatoes with all remaining ingredients. Singe and remove all pinfeathers from an eight-nine-pound goose. Rub the cavity and skin with a cut lemon and salt. Stuff and truss goose. Place on a rack in a roasting pan (breast side up) toss a cut clove of garlic and a stalk of celery with leaves into the pan, and roast in a preheated, 350-degree oven for 18 to 20 minutes per pound. Prick the skin, around the wings and legs, with a fork to release the fat. Baste occasionally with pan drippings. When goose is tender and the skin brown and crisp, place on a heated platter and garnish with watercress. Serve with applesauce.

INDIAN PUDDING

1/4 cup corn meal
2 cups hot milk

1/4 cup sugar 1/2 tsp. baking soda
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. ground ginger
1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
1/4 cup molasses
1 cup cold milk
whipped cream
nutmeg

Stir corn meal, a little at a time, into the hot milk and cook over low heat or in the top of a double boiler, stirring constantly for 15 minutes or until thick. Remove from heat. Mix together sugar, baking soda, salt, ginger, and cinnamon, then stir into the cornmeal mixture. Add molasses and cold milk, mixing thoroughly. Pour into a one-quart casserole and bake in a preheated oven at 275 degrees for 2 hours. Serve warm with whipped cream and a light sprinkle of freshly grated nutmeg. Serves 6 to 8.

Here's how you can keep gourds bright

For bright colors and funny shapes, you just can't beat gourds.

Keep gourds firm and brightly colored for months by following these tips on proper curing from Michigan State University horticulturists.

Harvest gourds when the rinds are hard and the stems have started to shrivel. Do not let the gourds be frosted or frozen. This damages the flesh and causes it to quickly decay.

Wipe gourds with a cloth dampened in rubbing alcohol. Dry them thoroughly. Discard bruised or nicked gourds—they will not keep.

To cure gourds, hang them in mesh bags in a cool, well-ventilated place where they will not be exposed to direct sun or artificial heat. A cool dry basement, garage or shed should do nicely.

It should take one to two weeks for the outer skin to dry and the color to set, and one to six months for internal drying. You can hasten drying by drilling a hole or pushing a wire through the blossom end. This should cut drying time to a month or so.

After the gourds have dried and hardened, give them a coat of transparent furniture wax.

With proper curing, the bright colors of ornamental gourds should last several months. Use gourds in fall centerpieces and as door decorations. Throw away when they begin to get moldy or soft.

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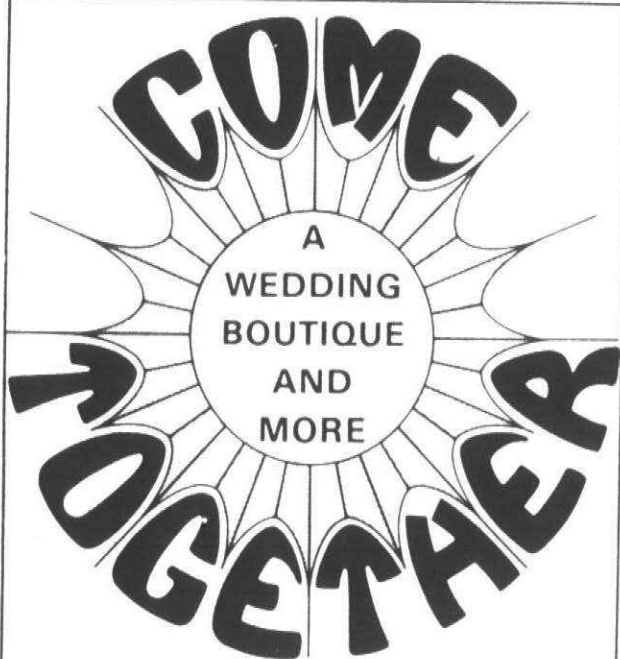
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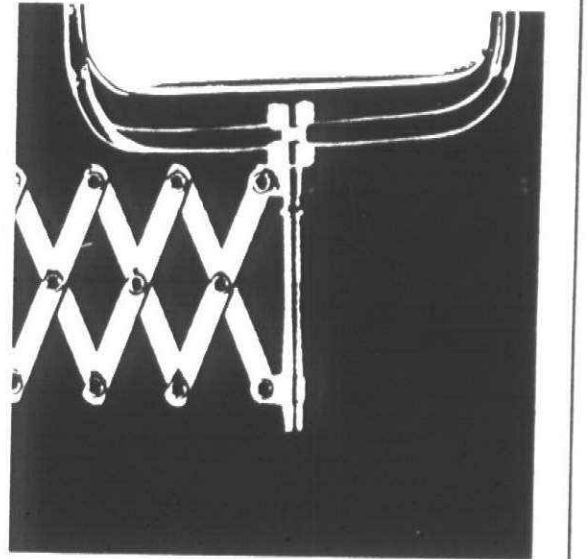
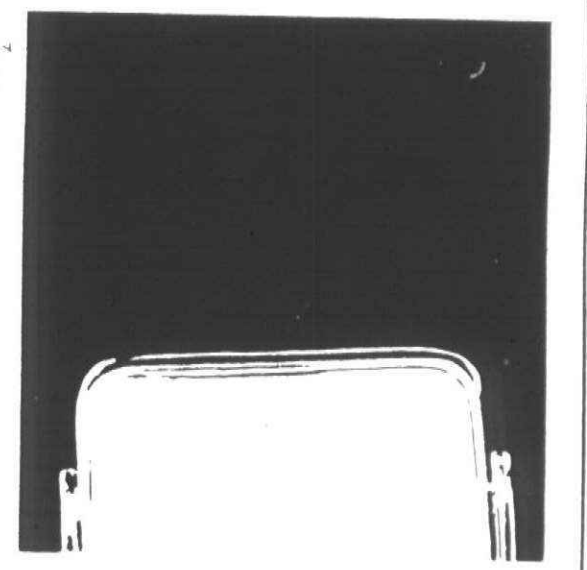
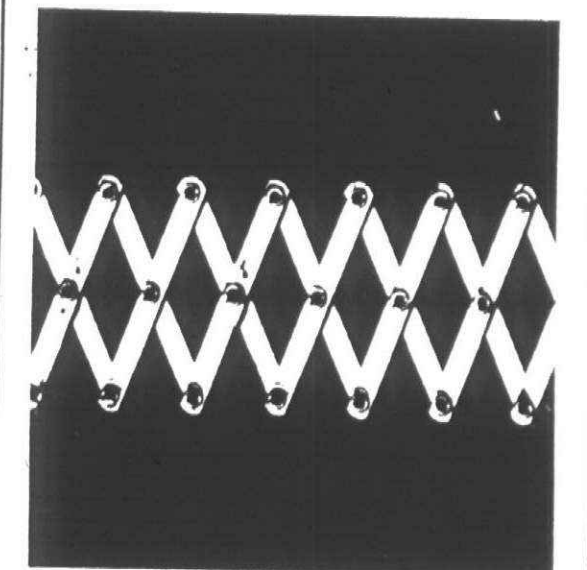
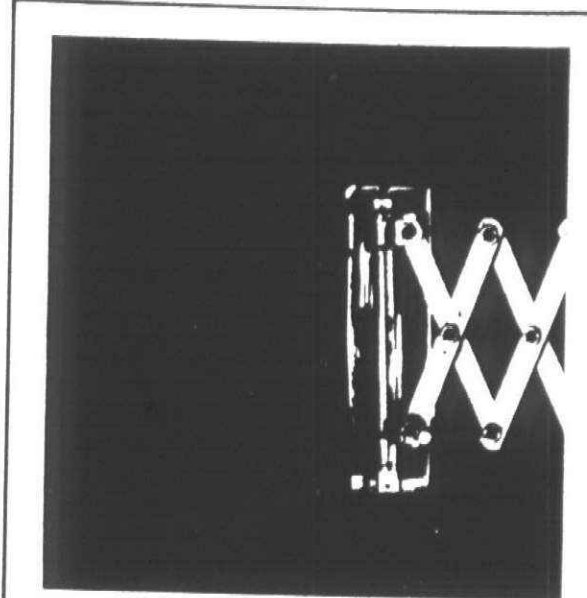
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Shrubs planted in fall develop strong root

By MARGE ALPERN

This time of year the soil is soft and moist, making it the ideal time to move, remove and plant evergreens, shrubs and trees. The ground is warm and more mellow than in the spring.

If you plant in the fall, the roots will have time to develop and establish themselves before the ground freezes. In the spring newly planted stock is frequently put in soil that is still too cold and perhaps very wet.

This condition discourages the adequate root development needed to help the plant withstand sudden rising temperatures and bright sunshine so typical of spring weather.

Unfortunately, most garden centers do not carry as much stock in the fall as they do in the spring. The recently held Nursery Day at Eastern Market was the perfect place to pick up a few replacements.

Prices were much lower than in the spring in the nurseries, and many of our finest flowers were there.

Speaking of replacements, I suggest you check the shrubs you planted last spring and make sure they're doing well. All four of the dwarf Alberta Spruce I planted last April are totally dead and will be returned to the garden center where I bought them. I'm sure they had been growing in containers that were too small, causing their root systems to be badly stunted before I ever put them into the ground. Replacement guarantees for spring planted material generally expire by Nov. 1.

TAKE SPECIAL CARE of the shrubs you planted last spring so they'll get through their first winter. Extra watering during the fall is the best protective measure one can take.

Evergreen and especially the board-leaves, such as rhododendron, azaleas and hollies, need additional watering. They continue to evaporate moisture through their leaves or needles even in the depths of winter.

It is important therefore to make sure the plant tissue goes into winter well supplied with reserve moisture. Once the ground freezes, roots can no longer extract water.

Burlap protection for young evergreens

in open, sunny or windy places may not look great, but it's only necessary the first year of a plant's life.

Snow fencing around boxwood hedges may not look great either, but if you want boxwood you have to protect both the sides and the top from the wind, sun and weight of the snow.

Wilt-pruf is a commercial spray used to protect board-leaf evergreens from drying up. Follow the directions carefully. Many people report considerable success with this product.

ANOTHER HELPFUL PROCEDURE is heavy winter mulching, especially with oak leaves.

Pile up the ground or mulched leaves around the base and then lightly cover the small, low shrubs with unground leaves. Large flat oak leaves pushed down in among the branches work especially well.

In the spring, remove part of the heavy mulch and loosen the rest of the ground mulch. Allow it to remain and decompose, enriching the soil.

Oak leaves are very high in acid content which evergreens especially like.

Cleaning the edge of the woods of small "weed trees" has become a simpler job since we purchased a "grub-ax."

This hefty tool gets right down under the runner-root system of cherry and other invasive scrub trees.

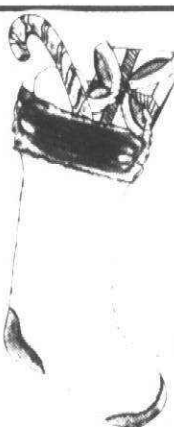
Many hyper vigorous wildlings send out such root systems and these trees must not be just cut off at the base or more new strong shoots will pop up again next spring.

Obviously what was acceptable underbrush on the edge of the woods last year benefitted from my watering of the nearby garden and grew into real trees.

If these "edge of the woods" trees are not dug up they create a screen, blocking the view into the woods and closing the property down into a smaller space.

Removing and clearing the woods opens it all up and one can look into and through the woods. It's a job, but worth the effort.

Fall is an exciting garden season. Not just because it gives me a jump ahead on spring work, but because I love being outdoors in the haze of an autumn morning, feeling the soil as I plant young shrubs, bury bulbs, and prepare my garden for the long winter sleep.



Henry's better idea taken out of mothballs

Fair Lane power house again taps river's force

The private plant, garage and laboratory are probably the most elaborate and comprehensive of anything attempted on any private estate, noted the March 1916 issue of Architecture Magazine.

The "estate" was Henry Ford's Fair Lane, a 56-room baronial mansion in Dearborn. The "power plant," a four-story limestone structure completed in 1915 and described as "a most unique engineering development," supplied all electricity and water to Fair Lane for 36 years from the flow of the Rouge River.

Today, the Fair Lane power house, now part of The University of Michigan-Dearborn's campus, is the subject of an energetic restoration project being conducted by engineering students in U of M-Dearborn's School of Engineering.

The project to restore the hydroelectric power house was conceived in 1977 by Burt Burley, an electrical engineering student. Burley saw the historical and educational value of the landmark. He also saw the opportunity for U of M-D students to gain some practical engineering and work experience by renovating the deteriorating power plant.

"In its unique features and its relationship to Ford and Edison, the plant is one of the most valuable assets the University has," says Burley.

With some other students and the support of J. Robert Cairns, the school of engineering dean, and the university, he set out to determine the condition of the power house, shut down in 1960 after Mrs. Ford's death and operated only occasionally since that time.

Was such a renovation really feasible? The students attacked the problem methodically. They rowed up and down the Rouge River to examine the head and tail races and the intakes. They evaluated the equipment—the boilers, generators, and turbines—and noted the condition. They made detailed drawings of the entire facility. What the engineering students found

was an unusual hydroelectric power plant still intact; no major equipment had been removed or modified. However, in its state of disuse, the plant was inoperable.

After almost two years of hard work, the engineering students have succeeded in getting both turbines and generators operating. "We can generate about 15 kilowatts of power," says Burley, "enough to light an average home." They have built a test panel to harness this power for testing and demonstration purposes.

The students checked and overhauled both generators polishing the gleaming brass parts as they went. The governors on both were cleaned, re-oiled and adjusted.

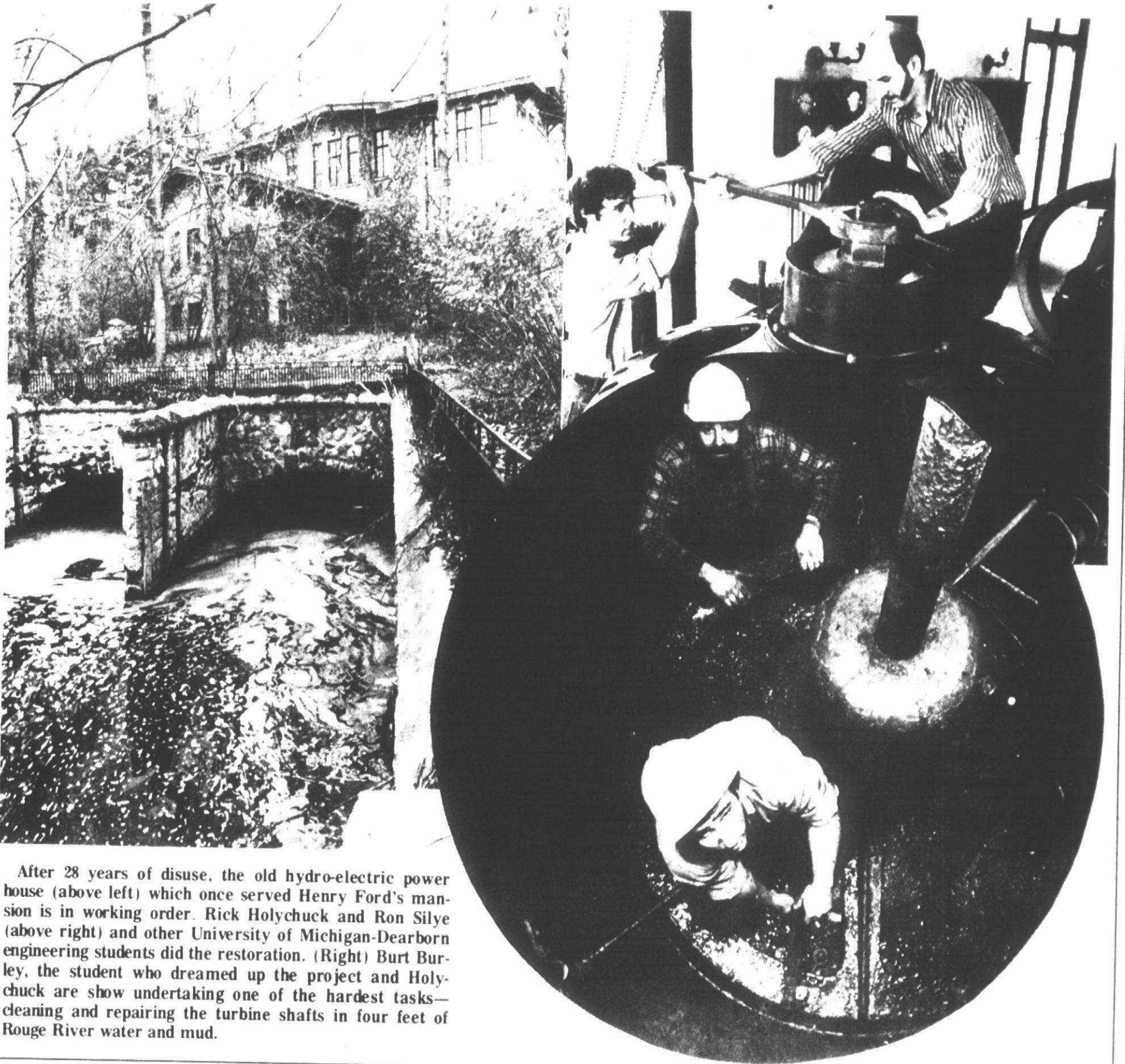
The turbines took a little more effort. Four feet of water and mud had to be pumped from the turbine shafts before they could be cleaned, repaired and greased. They also cleaned, polished and rewired the two-inch thick marble control panel.

The students studied the accelerators and decided to leave them for a future time. The same decision was made with the mud in the head and tail races; it did not affect the operation of the turbines.

"Safety was a prime consideration throughout," said Burley. The workers were equipped with hard hats and safety glasses at all times. A gas analyzer was used to test for oxygen and the presence of poisonous and explosive gases in the turbine shafts. Michigan Bell of Dearborn loaned air blowing equipment to the students to pump oxygen into the shafts while they were down in them working.

The research and repairs to the power house equipment to date have been costly. Expenses have been offset by approximately \$3,000 collected from community and university resources.

The engineering students have already been called on as consultants for restoration of other Henry Ford-built power plants, including Nankin Mills in Westland.

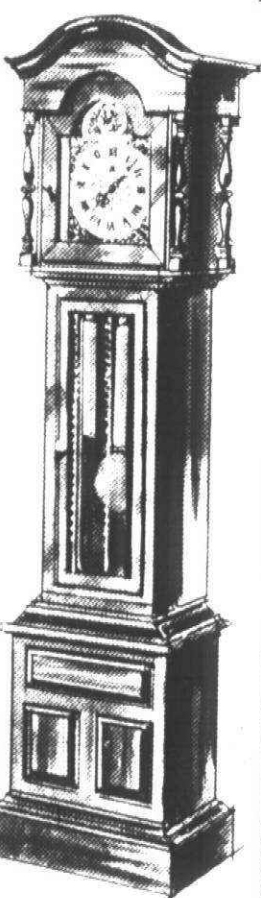

Biofeedback relieves ills caused by tension

A University of Michigan psychiatrist is teaching patients to cure themselves of the effects of anxiety illness by "revolving" against the disease by taking over control of their own bodies.

This overthrow of stress control, reported by Dr. Wiecher H. Van Houten does not emphasize psychotherapy or drugs, but instead employs biofeedback techniques at the University Hospital Psycho-Physiology Clinic.

A high degree of success has been achieved with a growing list of psychosomatic illnesses: hives, alcoholism, migraine, hypertension, difficulties in swallowing, chronic pain, severe anxieties, phobias, insomnia, "wry neck" and partial paralysis.

So far more than 100 persons have been treated over the past two years by biofeedback, according to Dr. Van Houten, who heads the Psycho-Physiology Clinic and is chief of the U-M Adult Outpatient Psychiatry Service.

He believes an even wider range of stress illness could respond to his treatment.

He explained that instead of the doctor giving and the patient receiving treatment, the clinic's method involves teaching and encouraging the patient to become an active participant in his own care. The patient is taught to utilize the body's own ability to turn off pain and turn down anxiety "instead of remaining the helpless victim of the dictates of his disease."

"NO MATTER HOW bad the condition, the patient can be helped to do something for himself," the psychiatrist said.

The key is teaching patients to achieve complete relaxation—at will.

"This is very important because anxiety and relaxation are mutually exclusive. You cannot be completely relaxed and feel anxious, worried or tense at the same time," Van Houten said.

Since these patients don't know how to relax, they also don't know when they have achieved a state of relaxation, the physician added.

Biofeedback monitors therefore are used to tell the patient by means of an audible tone when he or she has achieved relaxation as detected by forehead muscle tension, temperature in the fingers, perspiration and alpha brain waves.

The forehead and finger sensors are used most often, Van Houten said, because they are the best indicators of overall body tension.

Good results have been achieved with migraine headache patients by teaching them to relax their body and to raise the temperature of their fingers, Van Houten said. "When the hands become warm, the headache often goes away," he noted, "because

the pressure on brain blood vessels is reduced as arteries and capillaries elsewhere relax and expand."

ONE PATIENT had a severe case of hives which appeared at the same times each day. "All he had to do was look at his watch and if it was 'the' time, he broke out," Van Houten said. When the patient was taught to relax before the attacks, the hives stopped appearing.

Another patient suffered from torticollis or "wry neck." The chronic

spasm of the neck muscles so severe that, most of the time, he walked around with his head so far to one side that his left ear almost touched his shoulder blade. After learning to relax his whole body, the patient found he could loosen his neck muscles and pull his head erect.

New patients at the clinic are given a health questionnaire, receive a brief physical checkup, and then rate themselves on psychological and anxiety scales for later followup.

Treatment consists of seating the

patient in a comfortable chair, in a quiet room, attaching the biofeedback electrodes and instructing him in person, reinforced by pre-recorded voice tapes, in two methods of relaxation.

One is progressive relaxation of the body's main muscle groups, first by tensing them and then letting go.

The second method (most prefer one or the other) is autogenic training.

The patient is urged by a soft contralto voice on the tapes to recall a place in his childhood where he felt very safe and to imagine himself there

now on a warm sunny day, "to breathe softly and to inhale the warmth and let it suffuse his body."

LEARNING TO hold that thought and maintain a steady state of relaxation, whenever and wherever desired, takes most patients about 10 sessions at the U-M clinic bolstered by practice with tape-recorded lessons at home.

According to Van Houten, the very feeling of relaxation is completely foreign to most over-tense patients. After learning how to relax, he said, they

describe a sensation "of floating out of the chair," "a loss of feeling in their hands or legs," and, often, a euphoric high.

For alcoholics, this natural "high" can be substituted for that which comes out of a bottle and assists them in resisting the temptation to drink.

Because so many anxiety or stress disorders involve tension, this achievement of relaxation acts as a sort of psychic penicillin, the psychiatrist explained, whether the problem is a fear of flying or trouble sleeping.

In addition to crafts booths with artisans from the Northville-Plymouth-Nowi area, there will be the society's Country Store with items made by society workers.

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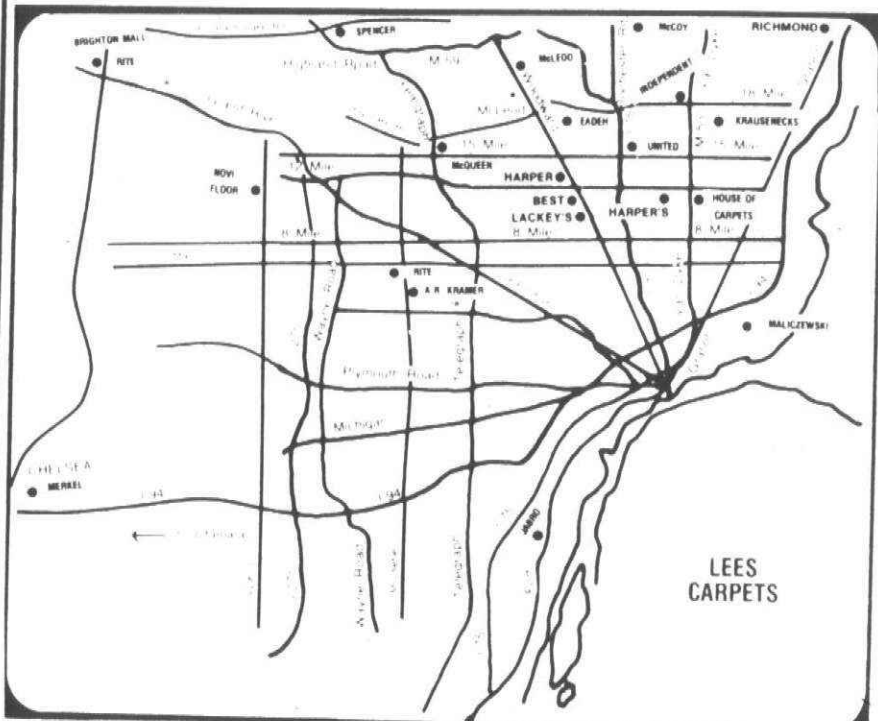

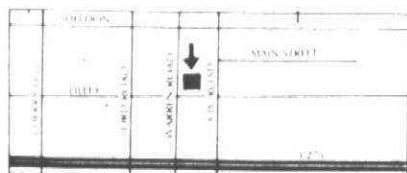

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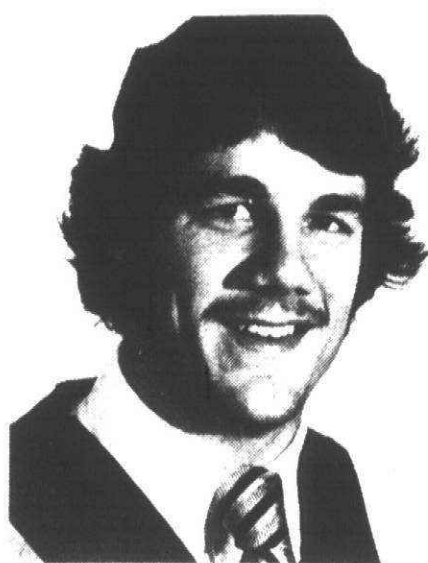

Livonia Churchill, with a 9-0 record, qualified for the Class A state football playoffs and won the Western Six League championship.

Livonia Stevenson, 7-2, secured the Inter-Lakes League title.

Plymouth Canton and Westland John Glenn, both 8-1, also had excellent seasons, finishing second in the Suburban Eight and Northwest Suburban Leagues, respectively.

Plymouth Canton, 4-5, produced its winningest record ever and Redford Thurston, 5-4, rebounded after going through two consecutive winless campaigns.

Detroit Catholic Central, the newest team in Observerland, forged a 7-2 record while competing in the tough Central Division of the Catholic League.

Good people make for good seasons. Area coaches found out just how talented area players are when they met recently to select the 1978 all-Observer football teams.

FIRST TEAM OFFENSE

Mouch was graded by the RU coaching staff at 94 per cent in blocking efficiency this season. He also averaged 38.7 yards per punt while handling that duty for the Panthers.

"Bob is considered a better offensive blocker than our all-state player last year Tom Piette," said RU coach Harvey Heitman.

The senior's blocking efficiency was graded at 90 per cent.

Much of Churchill's 2,078 rushing yards this year were gained through Neville's blocking area.

Also an outstanding student, his grade point average is 4.0.

"Paul is a great blocker and competitor and a great leader," said Churchill coach Ken Kaestner.

Barry Alderman, Redford Thurston, interior lineman. The 6-1, 217-pound senior was a two-way starter on both offense and defense for the Eagles.

Alderman, rated at 90 per cent efficiency this fall, was voted Lineman of the Year for the Northwest Suburban League.

"Barry made the inside and outside veer go for us and gave quarterback Mike Fitzsimmons outstanding protection," said Thurston coach Don Riehl.

Jeff Killingbeck, Westland John Glenn, interior lineman. Named to the all-Northwest Suburban League honorary squad, Killingbeck successfully carried out his blocking assignments 80 per cent of the time this year.

A senior, he stands 5-11 and weighs 180 pounds.

"Jeff is very quick off the ball and excels at the one-on-one block. His offensive blocking technique is as good as I've seen," said Glenn coach Chuck Gordon.

Keith Schneider, Livonia Bentley, interior lineman. A three-year starter and an all-Suburban Eight League choice this season, Schneider was

The senior, 6-0, 215 pounds, also played defense this fall and averaged seven solo tackles and seven assists per game.

"Keith was the finest offensive lineman at Bentley. He is very coachable and a fine college prospect," said coach Pat O'Donnell.

Mark Leidholdt, Livonia Churchill, end. The 5-8, 160-pound senior caught 22 passes this season for 416 yards and three touchdowns.

Leidholdt carries a 3.3 academic average.

"Mark is a very fine blocker in our option offense. He's able to make the great play and he has a super attitude," said Churchill coach Ken Kaestner.

Mike Kossick, Garden City East, end. A senior, Kossick averaged five catches per game this season and was selected for the all-Northwest Suburban League team.

He stands 6-3, weighs 190 pounds and runs the 40-yard dash in 4.8 seconds. Kossick also took care of East's punting and kicking this year. He snared six TD passes.

"Mike is an excellent blocker and an outstanding leader," stated East coach Gary Humphrey.

Rich Hewlett, Plymouth Salem, quarterback. Co-captain of this year's team and an all-state choice last season, Hewlett rushed for 675 yards on 101 carries and completed 25 of 45 passes for 465 yards this fall.

The 6-1, 195-pound senior ran for nine touchdowns and threw for six. He was voted to the all-Suburban Eight League team.

As a three-year starter, Hewlett ran for 2,261 yards and passed for 1,032. He totalled 254 points during a brilliant prep career.

Randy Larsen, Detroit Catholic Central, running back. The 6-2, 195-pound slashing runner set a single season rushing record at CC this year by gaining 1,275 yards in nine games.

Larsen, a senior and co-captain, was selected for the all-Catholic team and the all-Central Division squad.

"Randy is a very powerful and punishing runner," said CC assistant coach Jim Gibbons.

Doran Mason, Livonia Churchill, running back. A tailback, Mason rambled for 1,136 yards this season and scored 14 touchdowns.

A tri-captain, he is 5-8, 170 pounds and carries a 3.6 academic average. Mason started every game in which he has played from the first contest of his sophomore season.

Chosen for the all-Western Six League squad this year, Mason totalled 2,112 yards rushing and 26 TDs during his career.

Rusty Mandle, Plymouth Canton, running back. Mandle, a two-year varsity performer, stands 6-2 and weighs 190 pounds.

In eight games this season, he gained 1,061 yards rushing and caught 11 passes for 228 yards. He scored 11 TDs.

The senior was picked for the all-Western Six League team.

"Rusty is the best back in Canton history," said coach Dave Schuele.

Don Boka, Livonia Franklin, specialist. Boka, a 6-2, 195-pound senior, booted field goals this year of 41, 34, 39 and 41 yards. He missed only one of five attempts.

Boka also kicked nine of 11 extra points, punted for a 34-yard average and kicked off inside the opponents' 10 yard line 12 of 21 attempts.

Rick Hanschu, Plymouth Salem, specialist. The 6-0, 180-pound senior was named to the all-Suburban Eight League squad this fall.

He made good on all four field-goal tries, the longest of which was 32 yards. Hanschu also booted 26 extra points, averaged 38.4 yards punting and averaged 52 yards on his kickoffs.

FIRST TEAM DEFENSE

Dave Yudasz, Detroit Catholic Central, down lineman. Even though he was doubled teamed much of the season, Yudasz still figured in 71 tackles and six quarterback sacks.

The 6-1, 195-pound junior was also named to the all-Catholic and all-Central Division honorary squads this year.

"Dave is a very intense player," said CC assistant Jim Gibbons.

Scott Piper, Plymouth Salem, down lineman. Voted to the all-Suburban Eight League team, Piper had 12 unassisted tackles, 29 first hits and 21 assists.

The 6-0, 170-pound junior was named defensive lineman of the week twice this season and earned 90 hatchet points from the Salem coaching staff, more than any other defensive lineman on the team.

"Scott is our most aggressive lineman," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer.

Jim Hendrian, Westland John Glenn, down lineman. A 6-0, 200-pound senior, Hendrian was described by Glenn coach Chuck Gordon as "our quickest defensive lineman."

He ran the 40-yard dash in 4.8 seconds and alternated at fullback on offense. He was picked for the all-Northwest Suburban League team.

"Jim has excellent strength and angle technique," said Gordon.

John Stack, Redford Bishop Borgess, defensive end. The 6-4, 198-pounder was a two-year starter for the Spartans and was the team's leading tackler this season.

Stack was chosen for the all-Central Division team this fall.

"John was a durable, consistent player who was a 100 per cent performer both in games and at practice," said Borgess coach Fred Mush-

inski. "He is an excellent pass rusher."

Chris Papa, Plymouth Salem, defensive end. Twice voted Salem's defensive lineman of the week, Papa earned 79 defensive points this season from the coaching staff, fifth best on the team.

A senior, Papa is 6-0, 198 pounds. He had nine solo tackles, 20 first hits and 22 assists.

"Chris plays the option very well and has supplied good pressure on passes," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer.

Joe Rudzinski, Detroit Catholic Central, linebacker. Co-captain of the Shamrocks, the 6-3, 205-pound senior figured in 89 tackles. He sacked opposing quarterbacks four times and intercepted one pass.

Rudzinski was selected for the all-Central Division team both this year and last and named to the all-Catholic squad this fall.

The two-year starter is highly recruited.

"Joe is our toughest hitter," said CC assistant Jim Gibbons. "He's very active and could be the best linebacker this year in the Catholic League."

Dan O'Brien, Westland John Glenn, linebacker. A tri-captain with 4.7 speed in the 40-yard dash, O'Brien averaged 11 tackles and nine assists per game this season.

The 6-1, 204-pound senior received all-Northwest Suburban League accolades.

"He reads and reacts as quickly as any linebacker we've ever had," said Glenn coach Chuck Gordon.

Andy Pucci, Westland John Glenn, linebacker. Also a tri-captain, the 5-11, 170-pound Pucci averaged nine tackles and 10 assists per contest. He was also named to the all-Northwest Suburban League team.

Pucci also was a starter at tight end on offense.

"Andy was our most physical player," said Gordon.

Paul Dillon, Plymouth Salem, back. Co-captain and an all-Suburban Eight League choice, Dillon called the defensive coverages and had 14 solo tackles, 19 first hits and 28 assists.

A senior who is 5-10, 168 pounds, Dillon intercepted four passes and recovered one fumble this season. He was defensive back of the week three times.

"Paul was an excellent leader and two-way player," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer.

Kurt Hagemann, Westland John Glenn, back. Termed "our best athlete" by coach Chuck Gordon, Hagemann, 5-10, 165 pounds, was also honored this year with a place on the all-Northwest Suburban League team.

The senior has been clocked at 4.7 seconds in the 40-yard dash. Hagemann also played slotback on offense and scored four touchdowns.

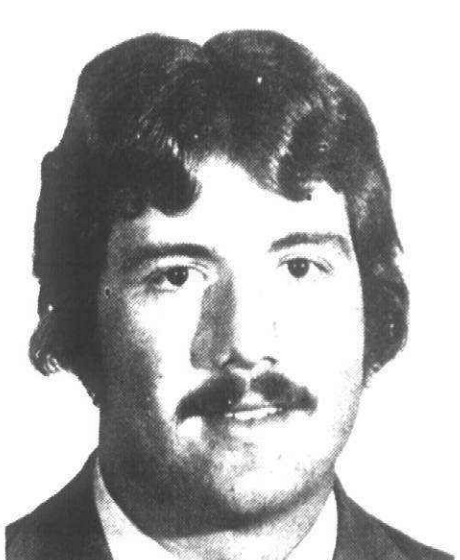
"Kurt gets to the football. He's very physical and a great athlete," said Gordon.

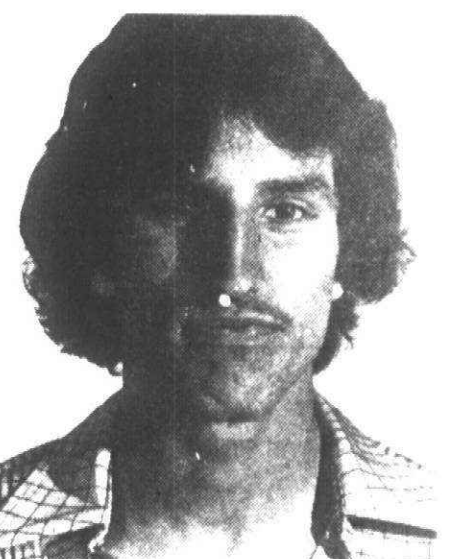

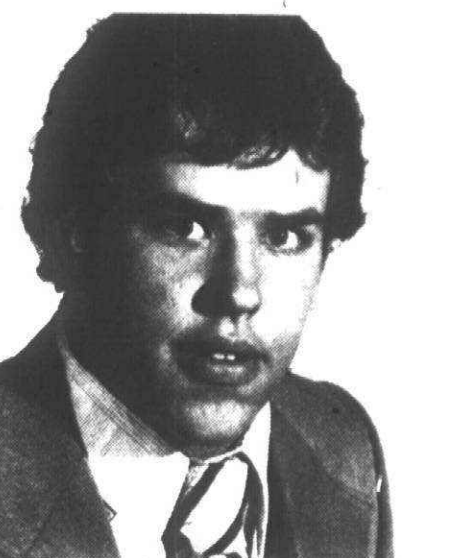

Persons interested in pledging may call Bell at Canton High School, 453-3100.

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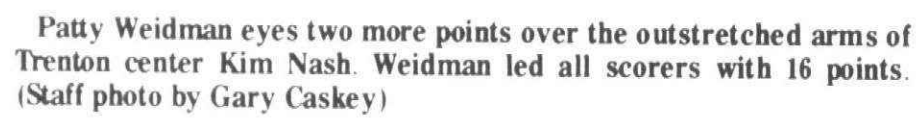

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U-M has 2 goals

It has been 40 years since the University of Michigan could boast of having the winner of the Heisman Trophy, the most coveted award in college football.

Back in 1938, Tom Harmon, the legendary halfback, won the high honor and became one of the most famous of all Wolverine football heroes.

Now, after this long wait, Michigan has another candidate for the honor, and all eyes will be on Rick Leach when Michigan entertains Purdue before another sellout crowd Saturday afternoon.

The struggle to keep Leach in the running for the Heisman Trophy will make the battle with Purdue a two-pronged affair, as the Wolverines also must gain a victory to remain in the race for the Big Ten title and another trip to the Rose Bowl.

Thus far Leach has set three records. He has rushed for 34 touch-

downs, one more than Tom Harmon, gate figured in 75 regular season touchdowns to beat the mark set by Danny White, of Arizona State, and gaining 5,968 yards in total offense to beat the mark held by Mike Phipps of Purdue. Leach has also become only the sixth quarterback in college history to rush for more than 2,000 yards.

It must be remembered, however, that Harmon and the others played only three years and this is Leach's fourth in the Maize and Blue.

Michigan is coming off easy victories over Iowa and Northwestern, and now it is a question of whether they can reach the peak of precision necessary to beat Purdue in a game that is a "must" for the both teams. Purdue proved vulnerable last Saturday against Wisconsin, but perhaps the Boilermakers were looking forward to Michigan. At any rate, Saturday's two-pronged battle should go a long way toward deciding the Big Ten title.

Winner goes to Silverdome

Rice, Raiders set for showdown

Over 8,000 fans. An intra-city opponent. A state championship game.

Birmingham Brother Rice won a tremendous 21-7 victory over Birmingham Groves last Saturday in the quarterfinals of the state playoffs.

It was a victory to be savored and enjoyed. But after the shouting was over Rice players quickly forgot about their conquest.

Coming ahead was still another foe—North Farmington. The Raiders, who like Rice are 10-0, invade Groves Field 1:30 p.m., Saturday for the semifinals of state tournament action.

"It's surprising how the players soon forget and prepare for the next encounter," said Rice coach Al Fracassa. "The game is over and we've got another one. They've forgotten about that Groves game already."

"We're playing teams that want to beat us really bad," Fracassa said. "Every game we have played has been like a championship ball game from the beginning of the season up to now. We know how badly teams want to beat us."

"THE KIDS HAVE BEEN under pressure two years with many things, like trying to keep the number one rating going," Fracassa said. "It's amazing how these kids are responding to

pressure. I have to give them a lot of credit. They are handling it well."

Coaches also are involved in the extensive pre-game preparations. One of the main activities is watching films of the opposition.

"I watch films all the time," Fracassa said. "I look for weaknesses. Sometimes I don't find a weakness until I see a game three or four times. I keep watching and sometimes get an idea, a little idea, that could make the difference between winning and losing."

Brother Rice has benefitted from that film watching to the tune of 24 consecutive wins over three years. Rice is the defending Class A state champion.

Shining stars throughout those victories have been quarterback Jon English and wide receiver Marty Martinez.

English has completed 82 of 132 passes for 1,172 yards and 13 touchdowns. An average of 63 per cent of his passes are caught by Rice receivers.

Exactly 50 per cent of those passes, 41, have been snagged by Martinez. Those 41 receptions have accounted for 685 yards and eight touchdowns. Martinez averages a 16-yard gain every time he catches the football.

Rice's opponent this Saturday, North Farmington, is a strong, well-balanced football team.

"I respect their defense and team quickness an awful lot," Fracassa said. "North Farmington's team speed is unbelievable. They have a couple guys who run 4.5 seconds in the 40-yard dash."

"THEY HAVE A VARIED offensive attack," Fracassa said. "They can keep you guessing about what they're going to do. They're nobody to play around with—what team is with a 10-0 record."

"We'll have to be at our best to beat them," Fracassa said. "They'll have to be at their best to beat us."

Fracassa discounted any advantage that playing at Rice's home field may offer the Warriors.

"In a game like this it doesn't make any difference where a team plays," Fracassa said. "It's the same grass. It's the same football field dimensions. After the whistle blows starting the game the players are not thinking we got the advantage or they got the advantage."

Fracassa mentioned his team's victory over a squad from Barberton, Ohio, earlier in the season as an example. Rice won the game in Ohio.

Schoolcraft, coached by Tom Teeters, easily got by its first-round opponent, Kalamazoo Community College, 15-1, 15-2.

The Ocelots then disposed of Lansing Community College, 15-11, 15-4.

Kellogg put Schoolcraft into the loser's bracket with a convincing match win, 15-4, 15-12.

The Ocelot girls rebounded to stay alive in the tourney by edging Lake Michigan Community College, 14-16, 15-8, 16-14.

Kellogg ruined any hopes of a Schoolcraft title by beating the Ocelots, 15-5, 15-5.

"We played well the whole tourney, especially our last match," said Teeters.

Ann Kolnitys, a freshman standout from Wayne, was named to the all-tournament first team.

Plymouth Salem's Peggy Moore, a sophomore, earned recognition on the all-tourney second squad.

Schoolcraft finished 30-8 overall this season with six losses coming against Kellogg.

The Panthers jumped out to a 19-8 first-quarter lead and held a 39-30 half-time advantage.

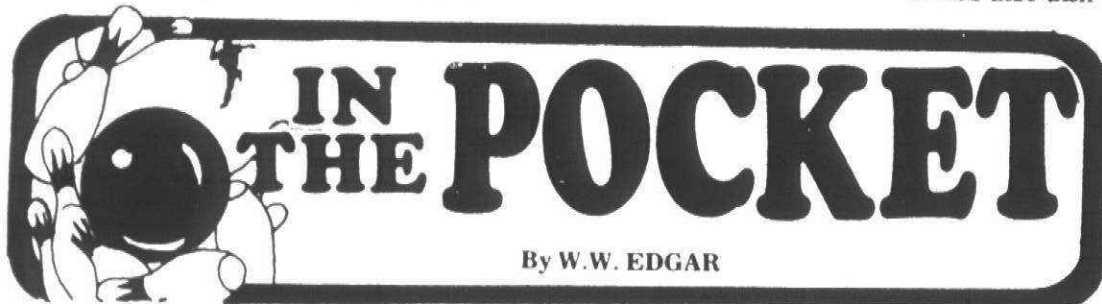
"We played a pretty good second quarter but got a little tired in the second half," said Franklin coach Chuck Hebestreit.
