Bused pupils left in lurch by 'ill' drivers

Barring medical complications, the "yellow flu" epidemic that hit area schools was expected to be over today.

About 80 percent of the bus drivers for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools failed to report for work Friday morning because of illness.

The administration claimed that it was an illegal work stoppage called to protest the suspension of a bus driver.

Spokespersons for the drivers, however, claimed the association did not call a work stoppage and denied it was an official strike or walkout.

Some 10 drivers did show up for work Friday morning, but not enough to send any buses out on any regular routes. About 45 drivers called in sick, according to Norman Kee, assistant superintendent for personnel.

Even though the buses were not running, though, some 75 percent of the students were in classes as scheduled Friday. (There were no scheduled classes at the middle school level).

Kee expected the majority of drivers would return to work this morning and the buses would be rolling again. Association leaders, however, did not know Friday how many drivers would be well enough to report to work.

WHEN ANNOUNCEMENTS were made Friday morning that the buses wouldn't be picking up students, the radio and television stations reported the drivers were "on strike."

Kee defined the situation as an "illegal work stoppage" and contended it was organized to protest a two-day suspension of a bus driver.

The driver reportedly was suspended Thursday and Friday as disciplinary action for using "foul and loud language" in a disagreement with an elementary school principal.

The suggestion that the "yellow flu" was an organized work stoppage was denied by both Sue Hall, association chairperson, and by Alice Horsted, association secretary.

Both reported that an unusual number of drivers had become sick at once. Ms. Hall also contended that the contract had not been violated as, to her knowledge, all sick drivers had called in that they would not be reporting for work.

KEE CLAIMED the administration was notified early Thursday evening that the bus drivers would call in sick unless the suspension of the driver was lifted.

"We notified every driver that they were obligated to report for work. We have a valid contract with the association which provides for a procedure with which to settle differences. But the drivers chose not to use that method (grievance and arbitration)."

Kee added that the association had been notified it would be liable for breach of contract, including the possibility of civil liability for any irreparable harm done to the district.

Later Kee said irreparable harm probably hadn't been suffered as the 75 percent student attendance meant the district wouldn't lose any state aid payments for that day.

The administration would document what happened Friday, Kee added, and (Continued on page 4A)

Boulevard or thoroughfare?

Ford widening creates debate

The Michigan State Highway Department has revived a debate over the widening of Ford Road by considering three alternatives for the Haggerty-to-Sheldon section of the project.

Eventually Ford will be improved from Venoy in Garden City to Canton Center Road. State engineers have already decided to make Ford five lanes wide from Venoy to the Canton border.

G. Bill Schins, a route location engineer for the department's design division, said state officials will probably hold public hearings this year on the proposals to construct a boulevard on Ford or simply widen the highway to a five-lane or seven-lane thoroughfare.

Last week, the Canton board unanimously approved a resolution stating its support of the boulevard concept.

Schins said state highway officials will take the board's resolution into account when they make their decision. He added, however, that the extra cost of obtaining additional right-of-way for the boulevard may outweigh the aesthetic and safety advantages.

THE DEBATE over the widening of Ford Road from Sheldon to Haggerty is a replay of a similar controversy that arose last spring over the widening of Ford from the township's eastern boundary to Canton Center Road.

At that time, the state highway department was considering the same alternatives that it has now suggested for the Haggerty-to-Sheldon stretch of the road.

Although the Canton Chamber of Commerce opposed the boulevard concept because of its impact on Ford Road businesses, then Supervisor Harold Stein strongly endorsed the boulevard option.

Stein and the former township board dropped their lobbying efforts for the boulevard, however, when they were told that the boulevard proposal could delay any improvements on Ford Road until 1983.

A project that will widen Ford to five lanes from Canton Center to Sheldon is scheduled to begin this summer. The project to widen the highway from Sheldon to Haggerty is not scheduled until 1981.

"But we never dropped the boulevard option for (the stretch of Ford between Sheldon and Haggerty)," Schins said.

Canton board members are endorsing the boulevard proposal under which two east- and west-bound lanes would be constructed on each side of a center median.

Township officials maintain that a boulevard is a better traffic-mover than a five-lane or seven-lane highway and that a boulevard is more aesthetically pleasing.

BUT SCHINS is not sure that highway department officials will take the same point of view.

He questions the belief that a boulevard from Haggerty to Sheldon will increase traffic safety on Ford Road since the boulevard will stretch only about two miles.

He adds that the boulevard would cost the state at least \$400,000 more than building a five- or seven-lane highway since an additional 80 to 90 feet of right-of-way would have to be purchased.

Mobile home park is cited for violations

Canton Township officials have begun a crackdown on mobile home park violations of building and fire department regulations, citing the Sherwood Mobile Village for dozens of discrepancies.

Township Supervisor Noel Culbert said he had instructed Fire Marshal Art Winkel and ordinance officers to check out the mobile home park after receiving a number of complaints.

The inspection resulted in a list of 32 fire department violations and 57 additional violations of Township ordinances, Culbert said.

The violations ranged from exposed electrical wiring to such blight conditions as old mattresses dumped in a lot.

According to ordinance officer Bruce Phillips, the responsibility for the violations can rest with either the mobile home owner, the park owner, or both, depending on the problem.

Ordinance violations can carry a fine of up to \$500 and 90 days in jail.

Phillips said he had not personally been out to the trailer park for three years, although he had found many violations at the park the last time he was there.

Phillips said the ordinance department was removed from duties concerning the trailer park violations at the order of former Supervisor Harold Stein.

The park violations had become the responsibility of the Township building department.

The ordinance officer said many of those original violations still existed when he returned to the park at Culbert's request.

Culbert has returned the duty to the ordinance department, although Phillips said the building department and fire department are still closely involved.

"We wouldn't necessarily know if something is a building violation. Our (the ordinance department) job is to make sure ordinances are enforced," Phillips said.

Trash pick-up days changed

The garbage pickup schedule will be changed for most Canton residents when a new company takes over refuse collection beginning April 16.

Canton Re-cycling, owned by the Denski brothers, has been awarded the contract for garbage pickup following bids submitted by the Canton Township Board of Trustees.

The new schedule provides for the following arrangement:

• MONDAY — All of Warren Road

and homes north of Warren.

• TUESDAY — All of Ford Road and homes north of Ford Road to Warren.

• WEDNESDAY — All of Cherry Hill and homes north to Ford Road; all of Canton Center Road south of Ford Road and the area west of Canton Center and south of Ford Road.

• THURSDAY — The southeast one-fourth of the township and all the area south of Cherry Hill east of Canton Center.

• FRIDAY — Miscellaneous.

The new company will pick up all items on the specified day, eliminating the need for the former collector's special pickup program.

Canton residents will have free dumping privileges at the dump on Lilley Road south of Michigan Avenue. A registration card for this purpose must be obtained in advance at the township administration building.

The phone number of Canton Re-cycling is 455-1030.

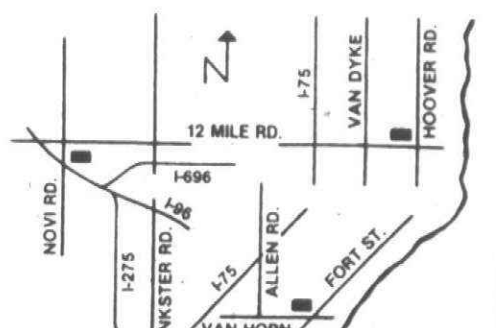

Decade of leadership ends

Deputies' union chief announces resignation

After 10 years at the helm, James Akhtar resigned the presidency of the powerful Wayne County Sheriff's Deputies Local No. 502 last week.

Akhtar, 36, a Plymouth Township resident, cited personal reasons, including time for his family, as the motive for stepping down.

He also announced he would become Sheriff William Lucas' personal liaison with township boards to negotiate contracts for police service.

He also will work with cities within Wayne County to implement a recent state \$1½ million appropriation for selective traffic enforcement and motor

vehicle inspection through the sheriff's department.

A detective and handwriting analysis expert, Akhtar has been the chief mover behind negotiations with Plymouth Township to contract for police services with the sheriff's patrol.

As head of the local, a member of the National Police Officers Association, AFL-CIO, Akhtar "raised the pay and fringe benefits of the members to the highest in the nation," he says.

He counts among his other achievements benefiting the 450-person sheriff's force the success of his lobbying efforts to secure \$10 million to sheriff's departments through the recent passage of the state secondary road bill.

That bill provides the \$1½ million to Wayne County for motor vehicle inspections and traffic enforcement executed by the sheriff's department.

He also considers enactment of the bill which requires charter townships to provide law enforcement as another highlight of his career.

SUCCEEDING AKHTAR will be vice president Alex Robertson of Dearborn Heights, also a detective with the sheriff's department.

Robertson will face the challenge of winning the allegiance of deputies who thwarted an earlier retirement attempt on the part of Akhtar, who was

the youngest president in the international union when he took office in 1969 at the age of 26.

Members were shocked by the resignation, which was announced at a Thursday night meeting, according to Andy Pruner, a Plymouth Township resident and sheriff's deputy.

Akhtar had announced his retirement before the last election, but decided to stay on the job until the contract was implemented this winter after a contingency of deputies appeared at his home to plead their case.

But Akhtar assumes the majority of county officials will be pleased to "have a thorn taken out of their sides,"

he said last week.

During his career, Akhtar founded and retains the presidency of the Deputy Sheriffs Association of Michigan, an organization formed to improve the professional standards of law enforcement and lobby for related legislation.

A graduate of Wayne State University, Akhtar said he plans to pursue law school studies in the future.

"I'm taking a \$15,000 cut in salary," he said, but also hopes to cut down on his usual 12-hour work day and free his time for family and studies.

As president of the union, he earned \$38,000 annually. His salary with the department, with 15 years of seniority,

is \$23,192 per year.

He also has placed his name with the American Arbitrators Panelists of Arbitrators and Michigan Employment Relations Commission (MERC).

"I expect to be doing some arbitrating soon," he added. "Who's more qualified?"

Many arbitrators have come out of the labor movement, he maintained.

The police labor movement has contributed much of what has transpired in terms of case law through the establishment of arbitration precedents, he added.

Akhtar plans to move to Livonia.

od (grievance and arbitration)." Kee added that the association had been notified it would be liable for breach of contract, including the possibility of civil liability for any irreparable harm done to the district.

Later Kee said irreparable harm probably hadn't been suffered as the 75 percent student attendance meant the district wouldn't lose any state aid payments for that day.

The administration would document what happened Friday, Kee added, and then decide what action to take. He indicated that pay would be withheld for that day.

Because the suspended driver will be returning to work today, Kee speculated Friday that most of the other drivers also would be reporting for work.

"We did have 10 drivers show up but that wasn't enough to pick up students, except in emergency situations. We did send buses out to Proud Lake to pick up students attending sixth grade camp and bring them home."

The contract with the bus drivers is due to expire in June.

MS. HALL, who has been out a few days on medical leave after suffering a fractured skull from a fall, explained that "apparently we just have a lot of sick people today."

"I have talked with a few drivers and understand that already seven have been told by their doctor they are too sick to be working next week. One friend has walking pneumonia."

She said she had called the board of officers and learned notices were being sent to drivers warning them against participating in an illegal work stoppage. "But even though I'm association chairman I wasn't sent one. So I don't know what the administration believes."

Ms. Hall was emphatic in insisting that drivers had not violated the contract. "Our contract provides that for absences drivers must report to the director they won't be coming in at least one-half hour before scheduled to report for work."

"It's my understanding all those who were sick called in and so there has been no violation of the contract that I can see. From my information, all the drivers complied with the contract."

Ms. Hall said she learned drivers were at a meeting Thursday night and got upset about the suspension of the one driver. "Walt Bartnick (Kee's assistant) apparently was there and heard some of the drivers talking and jumped off the deep end."

She also stressed that there was no organized work stoppage of any kind. "If the committee were involved in any way in some kind of work stoppage I, as chairman, would certainly know about it. The committee has done nothing."

Ms. Horsted also denied that the committee had taken any action. "I'm home sick today and don't know how many other drivers are home. I have been to my doctor and I will be able to return to work Monday."

Schools competing in the district match were Salem, Plymouth Canton High, Lincoln Park, Ypsilanti and Willow Run.

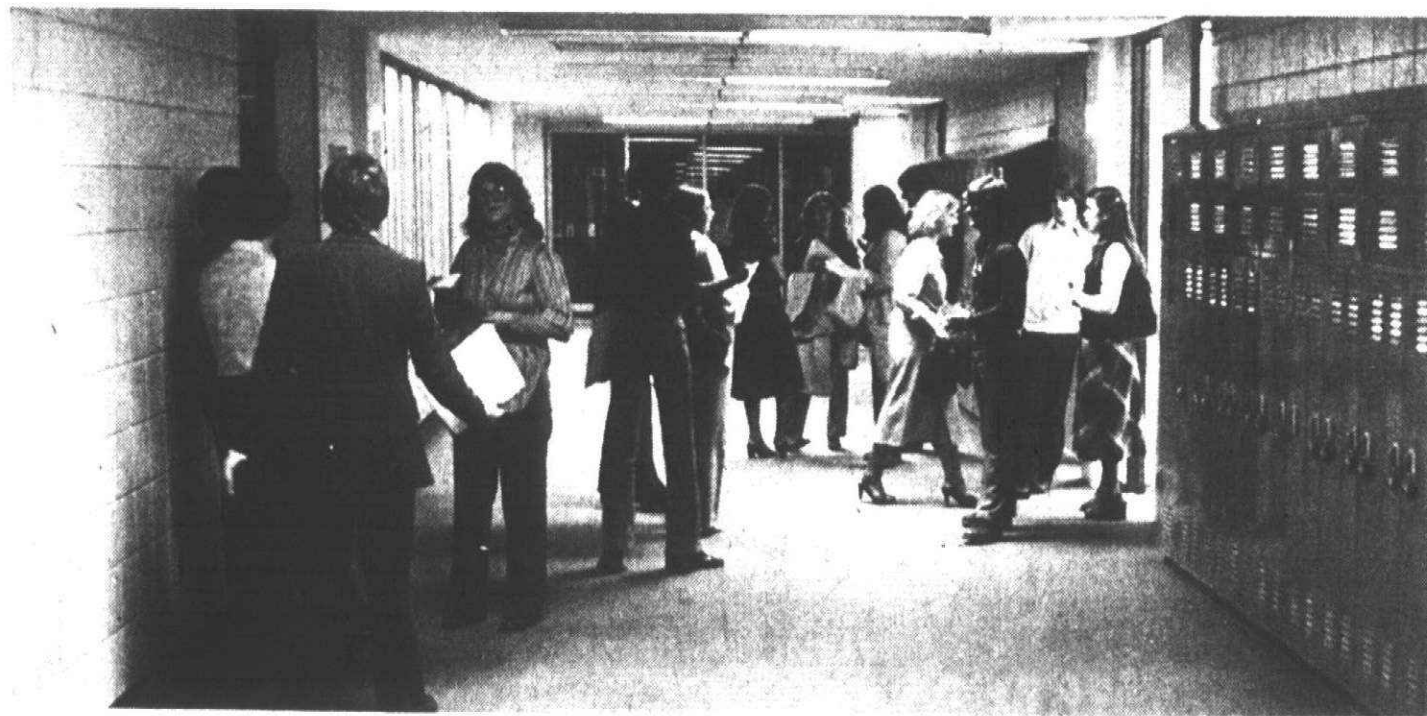
Canton had three third-place winners who now are eligible as alternates for the regionals in case a first or second place winner is unable to compete.

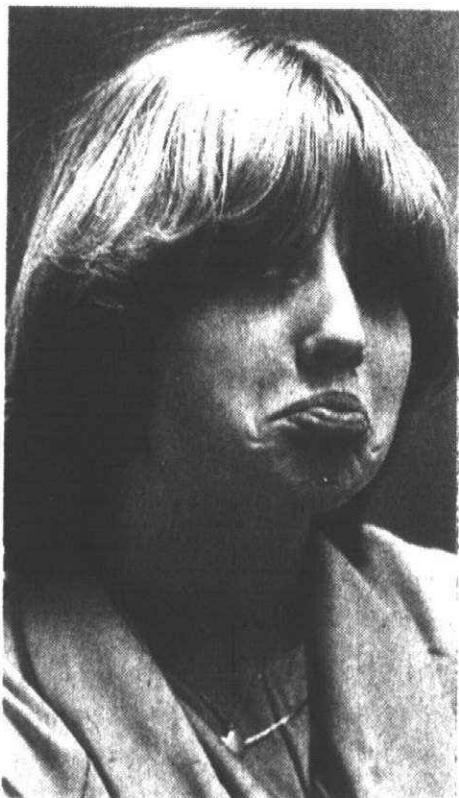
The district competition caps another successful season for the Salem forensic squad, which has recorded an undefeated record, placing first in all four tourneys it has entered.

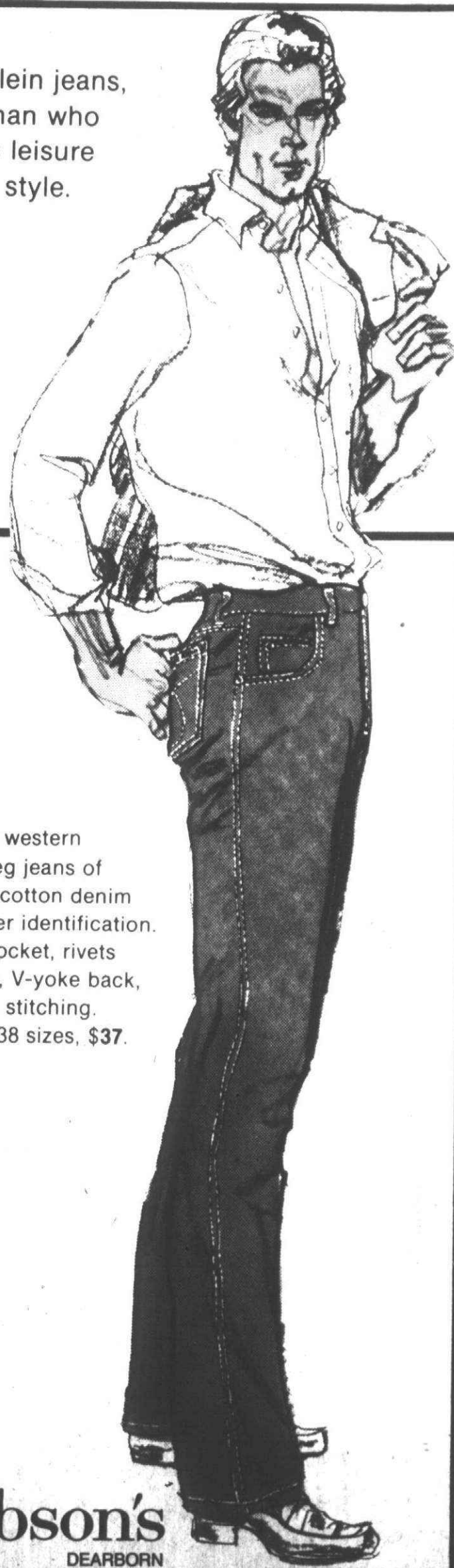

 "We have a responsibility to manage our money as much as we possibly can. A gold-plated road would be beautiful,"

he added, referring to the aesthetics of a boulevard. "But we couldn't justify building one."
 "Schins said the state highway department will conduct environmental impact studies on each of the alternatives it is considering for the Ford widening

project. Public hearings will follow.
 Residents' viewpoints will carry weight on the highway department's decision, he said.
 "But it's hard to say what will happen at this point," Schins added. "We have to look at a lot of things."

Salem swimmer picked

Canton champ paces all-area tankers

Western Wayne County is quickly being recognized as one of the best areas in the state for high school swimming talent.

This season, Livonia Bentley didn't lose a single dual meet, won the Suburban Eight League championship and the Redford Union Relays and finished fifth in the Class A state meet.

Plymouth Canton won its first Western Six League title and Paul Petersen, a Canton junior, won two individual events at the Class A finals.

Livonia Stevenson claimed the Inter-Lakes League championship and Detroit Catholic Central tied for the Catholic League title.

Even teams that didn't win league or state laurels showed improvement this winter. The swimmers who appeared in our weekly listing ranked with the best in Michigan.

Area coaches met recently to select the 1979 all-Observer swim team. The final listing was the basis for most selections.

Because there were so many quality poolmen in the area, swimmers named to the all-Observer team were limited to one individual event.

Many at-large selectees are included on the honorary squad.

50-yard freestyle, Kevin Gauthier, Livonia Bentley — A three-time member of the all-Observer team, Gauthier holds Bentley and pool records in the sprint freestyle with a time of 22.0 seconds.

The senior placed third in the 50 freestyle at the Class A state meet.

Gauthier this season was Suburban Eight League champion in the 100-yard backstroke and swam a leg on Bentley's conference championship medley relay team.

He also earned a spot on the all-area medley relay team.

100-yard freestyle, Brian Ellis, Livonia Bentley — Ellis, a transfer student from Garden City-West, was undefeated in this event during dual competition this season.

League champion this year, Ellis owns school and pool records in the 100 freestyle with a clocking of 48.7 seconds. The senior placed eighth a couple of weeks ago in the Class A state finals.

Ellis swam a leg on the Bulldogs' league championship medley and freestyle relay teams this season and has won places on both of those all-area squads.

200-yard freestyle, Paul Dudley, Livonia Bentley — Only a sophomore, Dudley this year set new school and pool standards in the 200 freestyle with an effort of 1:47.8.

He was league champion in the 200 freestyle, the 500 freestyle and swam a leg on the title-winning freestyle relay team.

Dudley also qualified for the Class A state meet.

He has also been honored by gaining a place on the all-Observer freestyle relay foursome.

500-yard freestyle, Mark Winter, Livonia Bentley — Described by Bentley coach Keith Wright as "the most versatile swimmer on our team," Winter holds a host of school and pool records.

This year, he placed first in the league meet in the individual medley and the breaststroke. He also figured in the Bulldogs' conference championship medley relay team and has earned a place on that all-area quartet.

A seventh-place finisher this year at the state meet in the breaststroke, Winter's best time in the distance freestyle was 4:51.3.

200-yard individual medley, Tom Smith, Livonia Stevenson — Smith, a senior, was Inter-Lakes League champion this year in the IM and the 500 freestyle. He owns league records in those two events plus the 200 freestyle.

Smith has placed in the Class A state finals in two events all three years of his high-school career.

His best time in the IM this winter was 1:56.9.

Some of Smith's times this season were 22.8 in the 50 freestyle, 4:36.1 in the 500 freestyle and 55.0 seconds in the 100 backstroke.

100-yard backstroke, Larry Hein, Livonia Stevenson — Hein swam to Inter-Lakes League titles this year in the 100 butterfly and the 100 backstroke and set a new conference record with his effort in the latter event.

The junior also holds the league record in the 50 freestyle which was set last season.

A state qualifier in the backstroke, Hein's best time this year was 56.0 seconds.

"Larry swims all strokes very well and was consistent point-getter all season long," said Stevenson coach Lois McDonald.

100-yard breaststroke, Paul Petersen, Plymouth Canton — The junior capped an excellent season by placing first in both the breaststroke and the 100 butterfly at the Class A state meet.

Petersen finished first at the Western Six League Meet in the breaststroke, butterfly and swam a leg on the Chiefs' title-winning medley relay team.

His best time this season in the breaststroke was 59.4 seconds. He has been voted a tri-captain for next year.

"Paul is an extremely hard worker who shows the best kind of leadership by example," said Canton coach Bill Faunce.

100-yard butterfly, Dave Giandiletti, Livonia Bentley — Like many of his teammates, Giandiletti set new school and pool records with a time of 54.5 seconds.

He qualified for the Class A state meet in this event.

Giandiletti, a senior, placed second in the Suburban Eight League Meet in the butterfly, but contributed to a first-place finish in the freestyle relay.

He is also a member of both all-Observer relay teams.

Diving, Mark Heiden, Livonia Stevenson, and John Schulte, Detroit Catholic Central — Area coaches, recognizing the abilities and accomplishments of both divers, selected both to the all-Observer squad.

Heiden, a junior, placed first in every dual except one this season, won the Inter-Lakes League title, finished sixth at the state regional and 16th at the Class A state finals.

His best score of the season was 275.55 points.

Schulte, a senior, placed first in every dual for CC this season, first in the Catholic League Meet and qualified for the Class A state meet.

A four-year competitor, his best score of the season was 301.75 points.

200-yard medley relay, Kevin Gauthier, Mark Winter, Dave Giandiletti and Brian Ellis, Livonia Bentley — This quartet, which had a best time this season of 1:40.3, established new school and pool records.

The crew also finished first in the Suburban Eight League meet, setting a new conference record in the process, and placed fourth in the Class A state finals.

400-yard freestyle relay, Kary Stapleton, Brian Ellis, Dave Giandiletti and Paul Dudley, Livonia Bentley — This foursome, undefeated in dual meets, set new school and pool records with a clocking of 3:18.3.

The group placed first in the Suburban Eight Meet, tying the conference record, won the RU Relays and qualified for the Class A meet.

Stapleton, a senior, primarily a freestyler, is a three-time all-area pick.

At-large, John Schoenle, Livonia Stevenson — The junior qualified for the state meet in the breaststroke and swam a leg on the Spartans' freestyle relay team which placed sixth at the finals.

Schoenle's best times this season in the breaststroke and the individual medley were 1:03.5 and 2:03.8, respectively.

At-large, Dave Miller, Redford Thurston — Miller was Northwest Suburban League champion in the IM, 2:05.5, and the 500 freestyle, 4:59.6. He qualified for the state meet in the individual medley.

The junior, who holds school records in the 200 and 500 freestyles, was Thurston's Most Valuable Swimmer this year.

At-large, Norm Gauthier, Livonia Bentley — A state qualifier in the indi-

vidual medley, Gauthier appeared in the weekly Observer listing in the IM, freestyle, butterfly and backstroke at various times of the season.

The sophomore swam on Bentley's league-championship medley relay team.

At-large, Kirk Albert, Plymouth Salem — Albert, a junior, qualified for the state finals in the butterfly and also belonged to the Rocks' medley relay team which competed in the state meet.

He placed fourth in the butterfly and eighth in the IM at the Suburban Eight Meet.

Albert was honored as Salem's Most Valuable Swimmer this year.

At-large, Eric Kirschke, Clarenceville — A three-year performer, Kirschke, during his career, has qualified for the Class B state finals in the 200 freestyle, 100 butterfly, 100 backstroke and both relays.

The senior has won Metro West Conference titles in the IM, 50 freestyle, 100 freestyle, 100 butterfly and the 100 backstroke, the latter two this season.

Kirschke this year placed seventh in the butterfly and ninth in the 100 freestyle at the Class B Meet.

At-large, Mike Larson, Clarenceville — A junior, Larson finished fifth in the 500 freestyle and 11th in the 200 freestyle in this year's state meet.

He has won individual league titles in the distance freestyles, the IM and the breaststroke.

Larson holds the school breaststroke record and shares in both school relay records.

At-large, Tom Parry, Garden City East — A senior co-captain of the Panthers, Parry qualified for the Class A state finals this winter in the backstroke with a best effort of 57.5 seconds.

Parry also was East's most consistent swimmer in the IM this season.

At-large, Ron Bonatz, Detroit Catholic Central — A junior and three-year letterwinner, Bonatz regularly appeared in several events this year in the weekly Observer listing.

Mostly used in freestyle races this season, Bonatz will captain the Shamrocks during their 1979-80 campaign.

At-large, Dave Pederson, Livonia Franklin — The senior set a Northwest Suburban League record while winning the 100 breaststroke at the conference meet with a time of 1:03.9.

Pederson also swam a leg on the Patriots' league championship medley relay team, which also set a school record.

Pederson also competed in the freestyle events and IM.

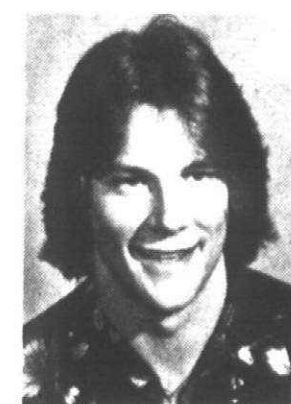

Not enough fields

Expansion puts league in bind

The recently expanded Plymouth-Canton Junior Baseball League heads into its new season with severe growing pains.

The biggest problem confronting league president Jim Schols is the limited number of fields available. "We had a superb turnout when we held registration and it has put us in a bind," said Schols.

The Junior League president reported that over 2,000 youngsters, boys and girls ages 7-16, are enrolled in this year's program. The Junior League held their annual registration during the first three Saturdays in March.

"This is the first year we've opened up our program to 16-year-olds which boosted our registration," Schols said.

The baseball president said there is presently a waiting list for youngsters who were late registering. "With the increased number, we are having a tough time finding ball diamonds," he said.

The Junior League Baseball season gets underway May 21. The older age group leagues begin June 11.

Plymouth-Canton junior baseball has seven leagues.

The 'B' league has been expanded from 24 to 28 teams. Some 511 youngsters alone will participate in the 'B' league.

The tee ball or 'C' league has also jumped from 20 to 24 teams while the 'F' baseball league (13-14 years) has doubled from six to 12 teams.

"THE POPULATION GROWTH," in this area has a lot to do with the increased registration," said Schols "and bringing in the 16-year-olds has also contributed to the rise.

"We wanted to give 16-year-old youngsters a chance to play because many do not make the Koufax or Mantle teams."

According to Schols, the last time the Junior Baseball League expanded was six years ago.

Canton Township has installed three new diamonds but that hasn't alleviated the problem for Schols.

"We could use seven or eight more diamonds," he said. "We're trying to scrounge up some more. We're looking into using diamonds which border our school district."

Schols said finding coaches and managers hasn't been a problem. "We always seem to find enough volunteers in that capacity," he said.

The second biggest headache facing the Junior Baseball League is a shortage of umpires. "We're trying to get more older adults to umpire," Schols said, "and we've used a lot of younger kids in the past. The pay isn't much."

Those interested in either managing or umpiring must first go through a training session.

With expansion, the Junior Baseball League must also evaluate its budget. Most of the money comes from registration fees.

THE REST OF THE MONEY is dependent on fund-raisers. Uniforms are purchased from annual candy sale proceeds. "We try to get the best price on equipment after making bids," said Schols.

"We find out how much money is needed for our program after the season is over and when all the donations come in. After the season we'll also know where we stand on expansion."

Besides the lack of fields and umpires, the Junior Baseball League for years has also had difficulty maintaining ball diamonds.

"The schools have only so much money budgeted toward maintenance of the fields," said Schols, "and when school is out the maintenance stops.

"We are going to make a proposal to the schools to let us use our own machinery, some of which is donated by a local business," he said.

Schols said the diamonds need to be "dragged" periodically in order to be playable.

"We're looking at all possible means and hopefully we can eliminate some of our problems," Schols said.

The league holds regular meetings every second Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m. in Canton High School, room 128.

King captures MVP award

For the second year in a row, Butch King has been selected the most valuable player on the Plymouth Canton varsity basketball team.

The 6-1 senior co-captain averaged 21.5 points per game in leading the Chiefs to a 17-5 overall record. King was also selected to the first team in the Metro West area in the Detroit News. He made the Observer All-Area second team.

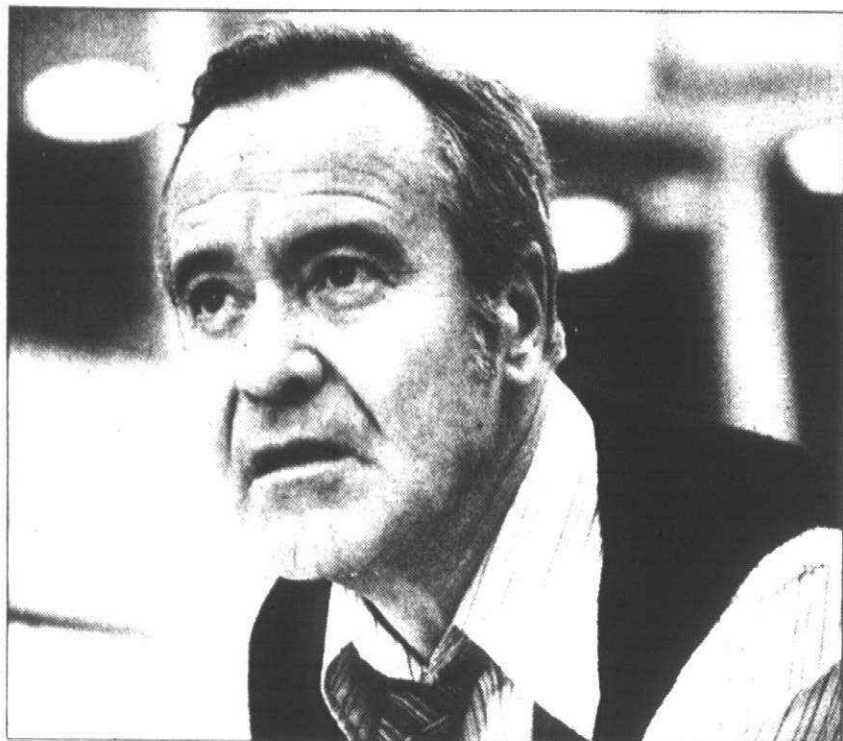

'China Syndrome' gives warning of nuclear accident

Whatever the situation at the gas pump, there is no shortage of fuel to heat up the controversy between the opponents and advocates of nuclear power plants. Throwing more coal on this fire is the film, "The China Syndrome" (PG).

"The China Syndrome" is a doomsday thriller that picks up the action with a cover up of an accident in a nuclear power plant and drives from there to an emotional climax.

The title refers to the possibility of an accident in which the exposed core of a reactor melted down through the earth, drilling a path to China.

However, before it could get very far, it would vaporize subterranean water and the compressed steam would then burst upward through the crust, spreading a cloud of radioactive steam over a vast area.

There is no doubt about the position taken in this film. Human error, human greed and simple defects in a complex system could blow us all to kingdom come, and then some.

THE VEHICLE for revealing this viewpoint is the operation of a television newsroom. The "backstage reality" of the newsroom involves the audience as witnesses to events.

This sense of realism and immediacy is maintained by sharp directing, crisp editing and a convincing cast headed by Jane Fonda, Jack Lemmon and Michael Douglas.

Fonda is a television newscaster assigned with a crew to cover a nuclear power plant for a, "Wow, isn't this something?" kind of story. While they are in a containment area viewing the operation, an accident occurs which they surreptitiously film.

Shown to experts, their film reveals that this "event" nearly proved fatal for the whole state of California, yet company reports and a government investigation sloughed it off as an incident of not much consequence.

Fonda becomes the investigative reporter, determined to expose the cover up and the danger, but still trying to play by the rule. Douglas is her hot-headed, anti-establishment cameraman skeptical of the station's motives in not showing the film. Lemmon is the chief engineer responsible for the plant's operation.

CAUGHT BETWEEN loyalty and conscience, his deterioration under threats, pressure and his own self doubts makes a memorable performance and leads to an emotional climax.

While the newscasters are fighting an internal battle with the conservative station manager, hearings are being conducted regarding the licensing of another nuclear plant by the same utility company.

The weakest part of the film is the depiction of the board chairman (Richard Herd) of the utility company as such an arch-villain, he becomes a cartoon character.

Tension and suspense mount as the plant prepares to go back on line after a brief shutdown. Can it safely operate at full capacity? Will the welds, whose records were falsified, hold?

"The China Syndrome" is a gripping film. No one can see it without being frightened by its implications. What makes it so effective is that it focuses on what everyone can understand — an elaborate system that malfunctions because of minor human failings. The film doesn't answer any questions, but it certainly raises them.

Elementary, my dear Film maker

Holmes duo snags Jack the Ripper

Notwithstanding the 79 years of films having to do with Sherlock Holmes, "Murder by Decree" — the latest wide-screen entry — promises to become a classic.

Intended along the lines of yet another "unpublished chronicle" of the great detective's career, by his friend, Dr. John H. Watson, the new film attempts to explain a Watergate-ish conspiracy concealing the identity of Victorian London's grisliest of malefactors, Jack the Ripper.

Certainly any cinematic effort pitting Holmes against such a villain as the Ripper ought to be decent viewing fare. As it turns out, the new film does succeed, perhaps more by virtue of its being true to Sherlock Holmes than sacrificing the character of the Victorian sleuth to the sensations of the present day.

THERE ARE, of course, sensations.

Take, for example, the identity of Jack the Ripper himself, a much-debated issue since the actual murders of 1888 passed away, unsolved. In "Murder by Decree" we are offered a solution, and like Holmes himself, a list of suspects which includes the Prime Minister, key governmental officials, even the heir apparent to the British throne.

Then, of course, we follow Holmes in his dogged pursuit of "Saucy Jack" through a maze of fog-shrouded alleyways.

The film's director, Bob Clark, does well in depicting the squalid realities of what were the conditions of London's East End, particularly the Whitechapel district where the Ripper's atrocities were committed. Overall, he managed to convey a vivid panorama, succeeding best when capturing the essence of the unpleasant or horrific lurking behind the doorways of Victorian propriety.

Add to this that the Clark film, based on an original story conceived by him and written by John Hopkins, is grounded in fact. Moviegoers may wonder about the presence of such a cast of characters in the case as the English prime minister, corrupt Scotland Yard officials, even a spiritualist medium employed to track down Jack the Ripper. Were they there in 1888?

The answer is yes, and the stellar cast of "Murder by Decree" portrays them admirably. The line-up here of some of acting's best includes John Gielgud, Frank Finlay, Donal Sutherland, Anthony Quayle, Genevieve Bujold, David Hemmings and, of course, Christopher Plummer and James Mason as Holmes and Watson.

IT MAY BE, though, that any review of this film penned by a member of the Baker Street Irregulars (the major

Sherlockian society) must be a bit one-sided.

However, there will be no harsher critics of "Murder by Decree" than those for whom the name of Sherlock is sacred. Given this, there will doubtless be irregular outcries of "This is not our Sherlock!" concerning the portrayals of their idols by Plummer and Mason.

Barely cast in the now-classic molds of Basil Rathbone and Nigel Bruce, who are forever stereotyped for fans of this early "dynamic duo," still we have in the Plummer-Mason team a believable and lifelike pair of portrayals.

Plummer as Holmes, for all his analytical mannerisms, is both human and likeable, seeming ever about to crack a smile. This factor many annoy some Sherlockians, who would prefer Holmes to maintain the constant countenance of a wooden Indian.

Instead, we see humanity brought to the role, as well as a certain sadness behind the smile. Plummer conveys a more mature Sherlock, who, as a man alone, realizes that his stronghold against evil-doers is rapidly eroding.

This perhaps is a significant trait of "Murder by Decree," showing us

Holmes and others within their age, which for its Victorian trappings of morality or honor, is in fact little removed from our own "modern" period.

AS DR. WATSON, James Mason represents the traditional friend and biographer, displaying all the dependable characteristics, minus the lap-dog bumbling of the lovable Nigel Bruce.

Mason's portrayal is of a Watson slightly older than Holmes, and this is projected as a suitable world-weariness, coupled with the wry ability of putting up with, no less countering, the edicts of Holmes.

As a Sherlockian epic, it is hazardous to compare the merits of "Murder by Decree" to the classic 1931 "Hound of the Baskervilles," regarded by many as the ultimate Holmes saga. Each may lay claim to that title in time, but if so it will be due to the faithfulness of their re-creations of the gas-lit world of Sherlock Holmes.

Based upon the success of such recent Victorian vintage set-pieces as "The Great Train Robbery" and television's "Edward the King," "Murder by Decree" will likely prove popular as

another retreat to the time when Britannia ruled the waves. Reflecting this, the key for a successful Sherlockian film would seem to be that of keeping Holmes alive within his own age.

There is a tendency today among film makers and authors of the "newly discovered" manuscripts of Dr. Watson to feel compelled to present a Holmes tailored for the present day, as did Universal Studios in its wartime propaganda series starring Basil Rathbone in the 1940s.

TODAY, THE FOUR novels and 56 short stories involving the exploits of Sherlock Holmes still manage to captivate readers the world over.

As his era's "man of steel," the famous detective of 221 B, Baker Street, prevails not as Superman but as a good thinker and as a man of action. "Murder by Decree" shows us this.

There is no overelaboration of Holmes' brief penchant for cocaine, as was the case in the recent "Seven Per Cent Solution," nor is there buffoonery where it should never be, as seen in "Sherlock Holmes' Smarter Younger Brother."

Gary Lewis and the Playboys, who tugged at teen heart strings in the mid-1960s with their hit, "This Diamond Ring," are featured at 9:30 p.m. tonight (Monday) at the Silver Bird Saloon.

Billed as "an evening of solid gold entertainment," the group will also perform its other chartbuster, "Everybody Loves a Clown." Before disappearing from the '60s scene, the Playboys, led by Lewis, son of comedian Jerry Lewis, were frequent guests on the TV rock shows "Shindig" and "Hullabaloo."

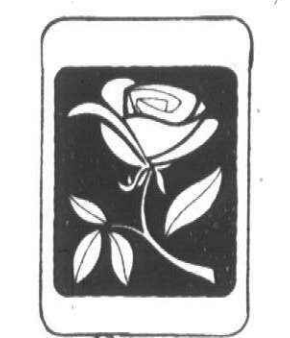

'Classrooms in community'

Business encouraged to help students learn

"Classroom in the community" was the theme of the second annual Business-Education Forum held Friday.

The conference, held in the Mayflower Meeting House in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Plymouth, was sponsored by the Canton and Plymouth chambers of commerce and the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Earlier in the morning, four workshop sessions were held in East Middle School as part of the Middle School Career Education Conference which tied in with the luncheon forum.

THE SPEAKER for the forum luncheon was Dr. Robert Weishan, Michigan Director of Career Education, a position he has held for the past two years

with the State Department of Education.

Weishan began by noting career education requires a "slight change in emphasis in school programs to bring out individuals who will be more free, independent, and capable of providing for themselves and making contributions to society because they have a purpose in life."

Young people, Weishan said, must ask themselves these questions: "Who am I?" and "Where do I fit in a way that will be satisfactory to me and acceptable to others living in the world with me?"

The main purpose of career education, he stressed, is to help young people find better answers to those two questions.

Weishan said the business-education forum was valuable because it indicated a recognition that "we cannot delegate solely to educators the education of young people. We cannot leave education to the school building alone and think we'll end up with graduates able to fit into the larger community."

"We must begin to break down the barriers, and realize that the community really is the classroom and that we all are educators."

ATTENTION NEEDS to be paid to the middle school level in career education programs, Weishan said, because of the stage of life 13, 14 and 15-year-olds find themselves in.

"Youngsters this age have a high quantity of energy and a low endurance for patience. They must be taught

through experience, not merely by being told.

"Middle school students must see how school work applies to success in daily life. We need to stop telling them and start showing them. And a good way to show is by 'shadowing' — having a student spend a day with a business person to watch daily activity in business."

"By getting out of the classroom and into the community, we can get these youngsters interested in an activity and we can demonstrate that someone cares for them. They can learn responsibility by taking some responsibility."

AFTER WEISHAN'S talk, an exchange followed between a reaction panel and the speaker.

Members of the reaction panel were businessmen Kirk Lorenz and Arnie Williams and educators Diane Pomish and Harold Gaertner.

During lunch workshop discussions were held between businesspersons and educators.

The morning conference at East included speakers from Plymouth-Canton, Wayne-Westland and Romulus school districts.

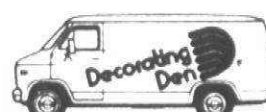

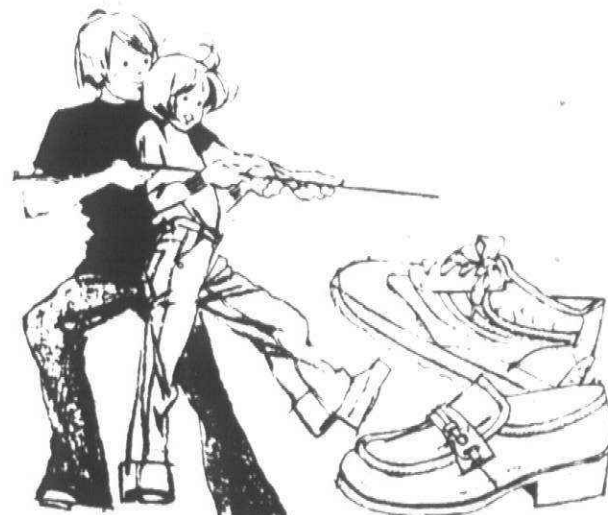

Agricultural blues

As we chow down on an ample supper or whimper at the price of food in the supermarket, we seldom have occasion to think about the people who produce that food.

Maybe a vision of the "American Gothic" couple fleets across our minds at the mention of farmers. Maybe we even recall the farmers demonstrating in Washington.

On the whole, farmers and their problems seems a subject of remote concern to people living in a primarily urban environment.

But tucked away in pockets jealously guarded from urban sprawl are people whose livelihood still depends upon the whims of the weather as well as outside pressures.

These farmers don't fit the old stereotype of taciturn, over-alled people with little more to say than "yep" or "nope."

As I discovered at a recent gathering of agricultural and media types, farmers have become an eloquent and politically active lot.

The function that brought farmers and journalists together was an "news background" sponsored by the Wayne County Farm Bureau. The Farm Bureau has become a controversial organization in light of its involvement with the Michigan PBB disaster and the farmer demonstrations in Washington.

It is also becoming an increasingly political organization. Issues of concern to the bureau extend far beyond the price of soybeans on a given day (although that too is important).

According to Elton Smith, president of the Michigan Farm Bureau, inflation is the major issue facing farmers (indeed everyone) today.

"We feel the devaluation of the U.S. dollar must be stopped," Smith said.

With true Republican fervor, the bureau president advocated an end to government deficit spending.

Smith said another big issue to farmers is the passage of laws to enforce the bargaining rights of farmers.

But even as farmers worry about their bargaining rights with commodities buyers, they worry about the bargaining rights of farm labor with them.

As one of the members of the Farm Bureau board of directors pointed out, mass labor is only needed for about five weeks during the year. If a strike prevents harvesting during that time, an entire crop can be lost.

The same thing can happen if the farmers themselves stop production to get the right price for goods.

Smith said the cost of workers' compensation is also viewed as a threat to farmers in the state. "In the case of some small farms, the cost of premiums is more than the cost of labor."

"Farmers with small amounts of labor and no workers' compensation are in a poor position. They could lose everything. And if they're forced to pay higher premiums than other states, they are in a different position than businesses which can move to other states."

"You can't pick up your land and move it to another state."

You can, however, sell the land to developers and make a nice profit. But as more land gives way to suburbia, less land is available on which to produce food.

It is a problem almost all the bureau board members have faced, and they don't have an easy answer.

They appear nervous about some of the state legislation introduced to preserve farmland and have doubts about a program such as Canton Township is trying to institute.

The Canton proposal, if voters eventually agree to foot the cost, would provide for a millage levy in order to buy development rights to the remaining agricultural land in the township.

Plymouth farmer Richard Sharland, president of the Wayne County Bureau, had this to say of the proposal: "If I could buy two parcels of land, one where only agricultural activity is allowed and one with full development rights, I would buy the land with full development rights."

Sharland admitted, however, that the land with full development rights would probably cost much more and have higher taxes.

Jim Erwin, a Novi fruit farmer, said during the course of the evening that he could have sold his land for a nice profit, "but all I really want to do is farm."

"But it's getting harder all the time. Maybe buying development rights is the answer. I don't know."

Although most of the farmers seemed to frown upon the actions of the farmers who stormed Washington, they too are concerned about the price they get for their produce.

They say farming is at best a tenuous occupation where the ends don't always meet as well as they should.

Apparently, huge corporate farms are doing well, but the small farmer is being driven out of business.

There weren't a lot of answers coming out of the meeting with agricultural folks, but there were a lot of questions raised that will have to be answered sooner or later, by someone.

Cutsie critters

A while ago, dog Toby walked out the back door and didn't return.

I got a call at work that Toby was missing — presumably lost. Could I stop by the animal shelter on the way home and see if anyone had picked him up and dropped him off there?

I said I would. Toby wasn't there, but a lot of other animals were. I was taken through the rooms at the shelter and allowed to peek through each cage to see if anyone was there I recognized.

The visit to the animal shelter didn't produce Toby. After arriving home, I learned Toby still hadn't returned. So I hopped back into the car and drove around the neighborhood, finally locating him on the block behind our house.

THE REASON I recall that visit to the animal shelter is all the other faces which looked back at me as I peeked into cage after cage.

I remember those faces because Easter is only about two weeks away.

Most of the faces were dogs and cats, some quite ugly in fact. But there also were faces of bunnies, hamsters, gerbils, ducks and chickens.

This latter crowd is the kind of pets parents buy for youngsters at Easter time. Wouldn't it be cute to have a live bunny or chick in the basket instead of a chocolate or marshmallow one? Cute, yes, but not very smart.

Not smart because these cute little

critters will end up behind cages before Mother's Day rolls around.

That's what I was thinking about when opening the mail last week and coming across a communication from the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA).

The message was the same as contained in a feature last year in the Plymouth Observer. Interviewed were local veterinarians who cautioned parents against buying cute critters for Easter.

THE FIRST PROBLEM is that the child's excitement over receiving a rabbit, chicken or duck often results in broken legs and crushed wings.

Children like to hug things they love — like Teddy Bears, mom and dad, and rabbits and chickens. You know what happens when a 5-year-old hugs a chicken.

And it's a traumatic experience for the child when the little chick he loves so much has to be put to sleep because of a broken wing.

The critters who do escape injury, and many do, 90 percent of the time will end up in an animal shelter (a nice word for a dog pound). And because space is limited, the shelter often has no choice but to destroy the animals.

ANOTHER PROBLEM, which should be obvious but isn't, is that rabbits, chicks and ducks are outdoor ani-

mals. God never intended them to live indoors.

These critters cannot be housebroken. At least, I've never been successful in housebreaking a duck. Kept inside, these animals can cause serious housekeeping and health problems.

The health hazard is something to consider. According to public health officials, children and adults who come into close contact with these animals may be exposed to salmonellosis.

Salmonellosis (in case you didn't know) is a severe stomach infection. The disease is rarely fatal, but is painful and often requires medical attention, including hospitalization.

Other household pets, such as dogs or cats, also may become ill if exposed to this gastro-intestinal infection.

The advice of the AVMA is "Don't let your Easter gift lay an egg!" The pet doctors' lobbying group also advises:

"Easter and the coming of spring should be a time of joy and rebirth, not a period of physical illness, psychological trauma and the needless deaths of young animals."

"The American Veterinary Medical Association urges parents to leave rabbits, chicks and ducks on the farm and give their children stuffed toys and chocolate bunnies instead."

That's pretty good advice. In fact, it's so good I don't know why I didn't just quote from the association instead of writing this column.

The Stroller

April—what a month

For a month that starts out with a gag like All Fool's Day, April usually straightens out and flies right.

The Stroller got to thinking about this over the weekend when he missed the old time trickery played on April 1 — even the carrying away of the old time outhouses down in the Dutch country. But he took note that the month of April has had more than its share of historical events — even more than any other month.

For instance it was on April 18, 1775 that Paul Revere made his famous ride through the night with the clarion cry "The British are coming."

The Stroller never has been able to find out how many citizens he alerted but it is a matter of record in our history books that he woke up somebody, namely a British patrol that captured him.

On April 9, 1865, Gen. Robert E. Lee surrendered to Gen. U.S. Grant at Appomattox by handing over his sword, thus officially ending the Civil War.

It was exactly 16 years earlier — on April 9, 1849, that a New Yorker patented the first safety pin. If there is any connection between these two events The Stroller found during his research, you will have to find the point.

April has been a great month in the sports world, too. It was on April 5, 1915 that Jess Willard, the big Kansan, knocked out Jack Johnson in the 26th round in Havana, Cuba, to gain the heavyweight title.

This is the fight that stirred a bit of controversy because as Johnson lay on the ring floor he was shielding his eyes from the sun. And it came only a few minutes after his wife, sitting close to the ringside, lifted up her purse to let him know that she had his share of the gate.

IT WAS ON April 14, 1910 that President William Howard Taft established a tradition by throwing out the first ball to open the major league baseball season in Washington, D.C. Walter Johnson, one of the great pitchers of all time, caught it and went on pitch a one hit game.

Among the other things The Stroller learned while doing his research was that on April 16, 1940, Bob Feller opened the season for the Cleveland Indians by throwing a no-hitter against the Chicago White Sox. It is the only no-hitter pitched on opening day.

It is interesting to note that on April 18, 1923 the New York Yankees opened their new stadium that often is referred to as the "House That Ruth

Built." By the way, Babe hit a home run that day to win the game.

It was on April 27, 1956 that Rocky Marciano, who ended Joe Louis' career by knocking out the Brown Bomber, retired undefeated. He is the only one of his kind to hang up the gloves without losing a professional fight or even being held to a draw.

APRIL 18 IS a banner day in the life of The Stroller, too.

It was on that date in 1924 that he took his first steps as a full fledged baseball writer when he entered the press box at what was then Navin Field. He was so proud to be able to rub shoulders with the outstanding baseball writers of that era.

Looking back over the years it was in April 1919 that his employment at the Bethlehem Steel Works back home was terminated. And it was in April of the following year that he started his stroll along the river of printers ink on the little four-page paper — The Catusauqua Dispatch.

They were the first steps of a stroll that will reach its 56th year, of all times, on April 5, when he again sits in the press box at Tiger Stadium.

Yes, April is a great month even though it starts with a gag.

The most important factor is to remember that no small business can afford surplus employees. Don't hire or keep anyone on the payroll who's not absolutely essential to your business operation.

Parkinson's Law applies here. Work will expand to fill the time available, so four employees doing the work formerly done by three will keep busy — but not with essential tasks. You cannot afford this luxury.

Don't hire friends. If things don't work out, you stand to lose both a friend and an employee. It's not worth the risk.

shouldn't expect to find someone to work for you who fills all your needs or wants. You must be willing to accept people who have most of the qualities you seek.

Pay what the market requires for the skills necessary and don't expect perfection. You and the employees will be happier. Remember, you get what you pay for.

Another factor to keep in mind is that two well-paid, well-motivated, capable employees are better than three mediocre, poorly paid, or bored employees.

Remember, also, the Peter Principle about elevating employees to their level of incompetency. A good secretary might make a very poor office manager. Be careful how your "promotions" work. You don't want to lose a

good secretary and take on a poor manager.

Consider a "trial" period for all new employees. A 90-day trial can benefit both the employer and the employee. If the conditions are stated clearly at the outset, there will be no misunderstanding. And, if the trial works both ways, the employee will also have a painless way out.

There is nothing as disastrous as a poor employer-employee relationship, particularly in a small business. Resolve any employee issues immediately before they erupt into major problems, and your business will be the beneficiary.

YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY number is the key to much of your financial and employment history, so be careful to whom you give it.

Fight for fairy penguins

As if the Fairy Penguin didn't get enough grief over its name, now it is threatened by the encroachment of condominiums.

Fairy Penguins, who reach a maximum height of about a foot, mate and raise their tiny chicks on the islands of South Australia. The largest colony of Fairy Penguins live at Summerland Beach on Phillip Island, a dot on the map below Melbourne.

Now you may wonder why a local newspaper would report about the Fairy Penguins of Phillip Island. My executive editor asked the same question when I told him I wanted to call Australia.

Here's the hook. A Southfield school teacher, Mrs. Jewell Anderson of Lathrup Village, has become something just short of a household word in Australia through her Stevenson Elementary class' effort to save the habitat of the smallest penguins in the world.

After contacting Australia's two highest-ranking officials by letter, the Stevenson third graders have become involved in a raging political battle between developers and conservationists. And the Australian media didn't miss the Southfield connection.

Mrs. Anderson's daughter Diane teaches school in Australia and lives about an hour's drive from the penguin sanctuary. When her mother visited her there last year, they went to the beach at dawn to see the little flightless birds head out to sea.

Part of the penguins early-morning ritual is a parade along the beach in a din of incessant yapping.

THE PENGUINS huddle together at the water's edge," Mrs. Anderson said, and push one bird into the sea to find out if any leopard seals are lurking in the water waiting to eat a Fairy Penguin for breakfast. If the first guy makes it, they all join him for a swim.

After catching fish all day by literally swimming circles around their prey, the penguins come back to Summerland Beach precisely at dusk. There they parade again for on-lookers and head back to little burrows known as rookeries.

So, when the Phillip Island zoning officials received a request from developers to build a condominium complex at Summerland Beach, Diane Anderson sent the news clippings to her mother, a long-time penguin booster.

"It all dates back to September of 1952 when I was pregnant with my son who is a lawyer now," Mrs. Anderson says, chronicling her interest in penguins.

"It was a hot day and I was so uncomfortable. My husband gave me a copy of the National Geographic because it had an article in it on Antarctica and the Adelle penguins, hoping that would help cool me off. I've been fascinated with penguins ever since."

AND WHEN Mrs. Anderson's third grade class at Stevenson heard about the threat to the penguins home, they

talked of little else. Mrs. Anderson explained that Australian conservationists are concerned that people who live in the proposed condos will bring their dogs and cats with them and the animals will disturb the Fairy Penguins breeding grounds.

Diane Anderson said in a telephone interview that other islands have seen the penguins disappear in the wake of development.

"When the penguins do their nightly walk, (officials) cordon off the beach area with ropes to keep the public back. But the penguins invariably will come under the ropes to shake a flipper with you."

Realizing that the penguins captured the student's attention, Mrs. Anderson decided to incorporate the birds into her curriculum.

The class is learning how to spell "flippers," "waddle," "penguin," "ecology" and even "regurgitate."

The class did penguin crossword puzzles and asked the teacher for permission to go to the library to learn more about the birds, a request a teacher rarely hears.

Even letter-writing instruction took a decidedly utilitarian form. The students learned the ropes by writing letters of concern to Australian Prime Minister Rupert Holmes and Frank Wilks, leader of the opposition Labor Party which opposes development on Summerland Beach.

"WE ARE KNOWN as the Stevenson Ambassadors," the letters stated, "and we like to think the Fairy Penguins in Australia are ambassadors too. We want to see them in their funny little suits when we visit you someday. We know that dogs and cats just don't mix with friendly birds, particularly those (birds) who love people and cannot fly. Please ask the people to find some other place to build their houses."

According to Ms. Anderson, the letter was held up by the Labor Party leader as proof that the Fairy Penguins' plight was more than a matter of local concern over new development.

Laborites were angry about the zoning officials' decision to keep a wildlife official from testifying on the threat by developers to harm the penguin's habitat.

The Melbourne media knew a good feature story when it waddled by. Stories on the class' letter to the politicians were printed in two daily newspapers. The host of a radio breakfast show talked to Mrs. Anderson live on the air one day.

Diane Anderson said she was sleeping when the radio program was aired. Later, several persons stopped her to ask if her mother was "The Penguin Lady."

No decision has been made on the developers' request to build condominiums on the beach, but Ms. Anderson said some landowners on the island favor new construction as a means of bringing revenue to the island.

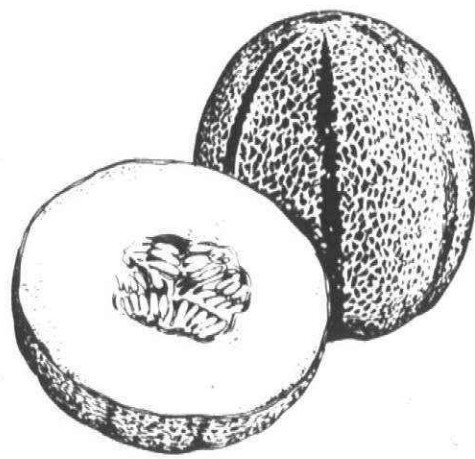
If the third graders at Stevenson have their way, the penguin parade will continue uninterrupted.

The peacocks are strutting about with the squirrels, showing off their fan-tails. The sea lions are huddling under a rock while workers feverishly put the finishing touches on the new marine mammal exhibit.

Groups of excited children growl at the tigers, and the tigers obediently growl back.

The snakes slither, a bear lounges on a rock, and the geese just wander all over the place.

It's springtime at the Detroit Zoo. The birds are squawking, the grass is coming out of hibernation and the wolverines are waiting for peanuts.

In the birdhouse, where some of the birds are free to roam through a tropical walk-through aviary, the pink flamingos huddle on their stilt-like legs near a small pool. In the next room, two parrots preen each other in a feathery version of the rites of spring.

Much of the ground is still muddy and what you can see depends on the fickle nature of the weather this time of year. But the summer's crowds are

nowhere in sight and the animals — some of them, anyway — take strolls around the grounds.

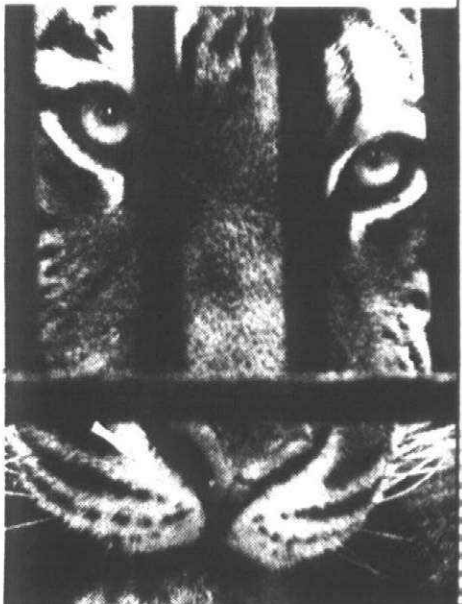
A pair of geese boldly compete for food with the camels and a king cobra snaps to attention when a child shouts.

"There's always a nice day where a crowd comes out," says zoo Superintendent Floyd Lodge. "That might surprise 'em. But they don't seem to react much differently."

Daily attendance at the zoo this time of year varies, "strictly depending on the weather," according to Lodge, from only a few hundred in the rain to maybe 3,000 in the sun. A nice day in July easily draws over 8,000.

With the lack of crowds, you can hang out with the emu as long as your heart desires; no one will get in your way. You can try striking up a conversation with a macaw; no one will think you're feather-brained. Or you can just sit down and have a picnic amid the peacocks.

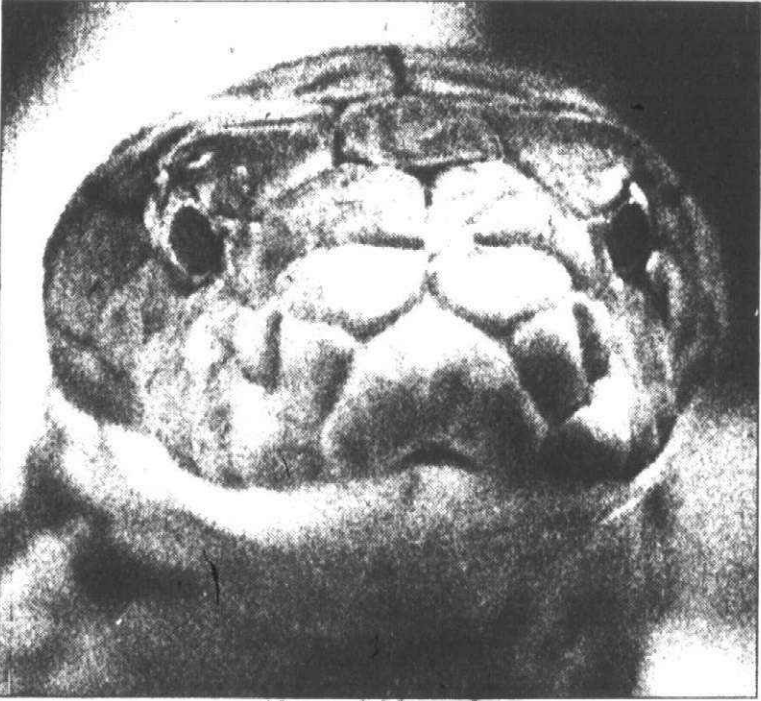
Zoo hours these days are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday. Ad-



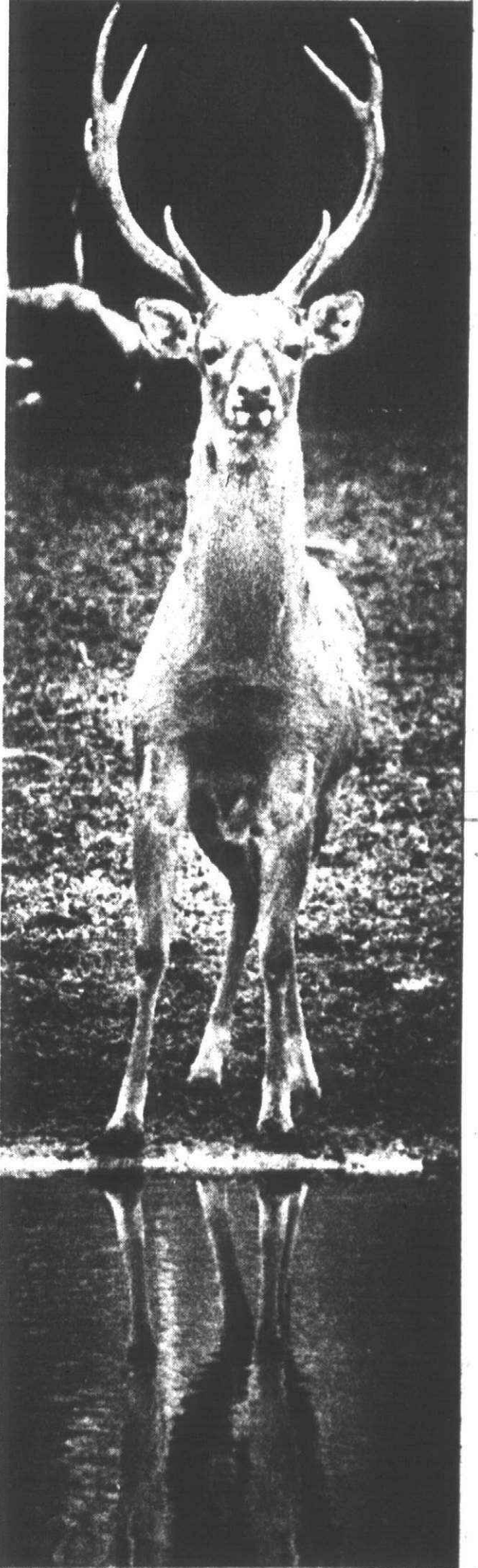
A tiger peers through his bars.

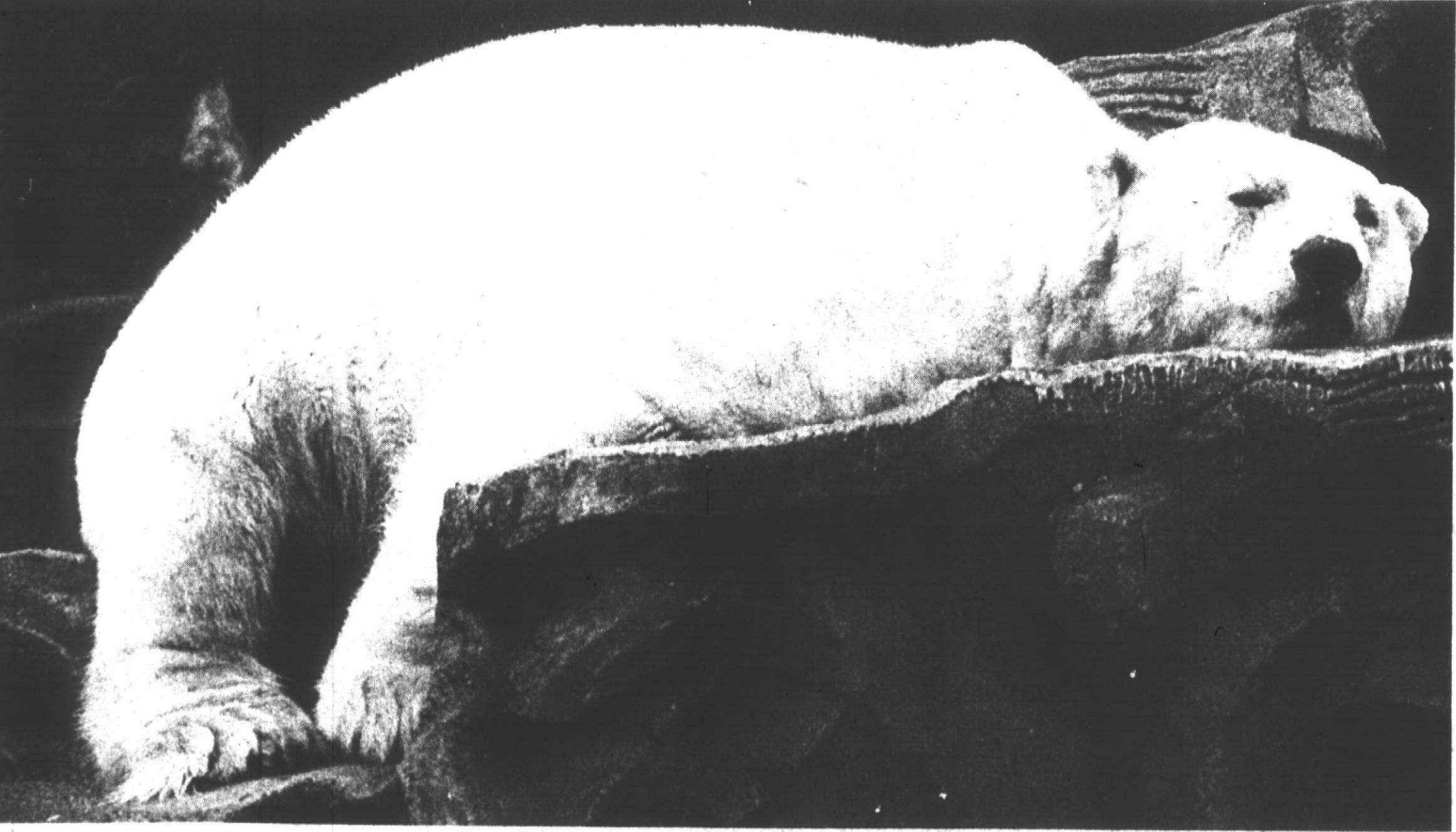

Center attendants protest

Attendants at the Plymouth Center for Human Development went to the picket line last week to "bring out the truth about working conditions" at the center.

Complaining of inaccurate media coverage, and unproductive meetings with center management, attendants staged a three-day informational picket.

Protestors distributed a flyer decrying a general lack of concern about the workers at the center, forced overtime and lack of proper safety.

Since March 1, some workers at the center have been forced to double up on shifts, working as many 16 hours a day.

The center is under a court order that specifies the center must maintain a staff-to-patient ratio of one-to-four on day and afternoon shifts and one-to-eight on midnight shifts in four of the complex's eight buildings.

In the flyer, attendants said the double shifts were imposed with little or no notification and resulted in fatigued workers.

Eranelle McIntosh-Wilson, acting director of the center, said the overtime was "hardly an issue" because it started in March and would end today.

"The overtime ends this week. They told us in February they would picket in March, and that was before the overtime."

Mrs. Wilson said she thought attendants were discouraged by media cover-

age they received in the past.

"I think the staff originally felt very fed up with the media and wanted attention showing them as good people."

Mrs. Wilson said the overtime situation would end immediately because an additional 93 employees who have been

in orientation begin work today. Another 85 are scheduled to begin work next Monday.

Mrs. Wilson said she had met in February with members of AFSCME local 1837, the union representing employees at the center, but that no demands had

been presented to her. Since then, she said, the union had not made any overtures to meet with her.

The center will be back in federal court April 4 to show it has complied with the staff-to-patient ratios imposed by the court.

Dial-a-ride for the elderly begins pick-ups in Plymouth

The first SEMTA-subsidized dial-a-ride service for the elderly and handicapped is awaiting callers from Livonia, Plymouth and Northville.

It will use taxicabs rather than buses or vans.

Part of the new Wayne County Essential Transportation System (ETS), the program offers rides at reduced rates for any elderly (age 65 or over) or handicapped in a 72-square-mile area of northwestern Wayne County.

It will be operated by Northwest Transport Inc. of Livonia and administered by the City of Livonia. The service is offered 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Its phone number is 474-3333 in the north part of the service area and 421-1100 in the south part.

FARES WILL range from 50 cents to \$1.10, depending on how many zones the rider travels through.

SEMTA (the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority) will pay the cab company the difference between the ETS fare and the cab company's regular fare — 90 cents at the start of a ride and 90 cents for each additional mile.

The SEMTA board last week approved a contract of up to \$60,000 for the period April 1, 1979 to June 30, 1980.

SEMTA spokeswoman Joan Kolodziej called the subsidized cab service "a demonstration program." The transit authority will evaluate the service at the end of the contract and consider whether to replace it with small buses of 10-15 capacity. SEMTA could also opt for both a subsidized cab service and small buses, she added.

Vern Foster, owner of Northwest Transport, has operated a similar subsidized service for elderly and handicapped for six years in Farmington and three years in Farmington Hills. That service is subsidized by the cities and not by SEMTA, federal or state funds.

BIRMINGHAM, Redford Township, Garden City, Westland and Canton Township have had dial-a-ride service for seniors for some years.

Robert Wisler, administrative assistant to Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara, said the city has long been interested in dial-a-ride service. Livonia has some 8,000 senior citizens.

In the past, however, McNamara had been critical of dial-a-ride programs because they were subsidized government competition against privately-owned cab companies. The new ETS for western Wayne County removes McNamara's objection. McNamara is now also chairman of the SEMTA board.

Foster said use of SEMTA vans for dial-a-ride ruined his cab business in Redford Township.

Using taxicabs is a convenience to SEMTA, too, because a legal dispute has tied up manufacture of buses for two years. The dispute was over what kinds of lifts would be required for public buses. During that time, SEMTA was unable to buy new buses, and manufacturers are still behind in filling orders.

CAB OWNER Foster maintains cabs will provide a "more complete service" for the elderly and handicapped than SEMTA's small bus dial-a-ride program. Although the small buses have wheelchair lifts, Foster said he expects his cabs will be easier to board for other elderly and handicapped persons because the first step on a small SEMTA bus is 19 inches from the ground.

But Ms. Kolodziej said persons with "very severe handicaps may have a problem using cab service."

Eligible riders will be provided SEMTA identification cards. They will be able to purchase monthly "SEMTA-CARD" passes and discount tickets.

DICK AND JEAN Wernette and Tex and Julie Thoman were in town last week. All four are prime examples of the truth in the old cliché "Our loss is their gain."

The Wernettes moved to Lake City (Mich.) and the Thomans to Alameda, Calif.

The Wernettes sold their home on Adams Street last spring to take up retirement residence in their year-round house on Lake Michigan near Cadillac. Jean had been a teacher at Starkweather Elementary School. Dick was an attorney. He had commuted to Probate Court in Detroit for more than 32 years.

Detroit legal circles still talk about his downtown retirement party. The number of judges, court officials and lawyers who attended testified to the caliber of man they were honoring.

He had a vital interest in the affairs of his hometown, serving on the city

commission for eight years and one term as mayor.

And he always was willing to call on his vast fund of knowledge about probate to help his friends and neighbors.

"Dick was the lawyers' friend. He saved them more time and trips downtown than any other man," said a local attorney.

DICK WAS guest speaker at last Wednesday's luncheon meeting of the the Plymouth-Northville chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons. His subject was "How to Avoid Probate" and he included changes in the revised Michigan Probate Code which goes into effect July 1.

He approved joint ownership of property for husbands and wives but warned against co-ownership of an automobile.

"Get the car in one name only," said Dick. "Every year judgments of more than \$100,000 are rendered in Wayne county. If the car is jointly owned, the judgment can extend to jointly owned property."

He suggested putting a POD (pay on death) notation on accounts, stocks and bonds with the name of the person to receive them. He does not recommend "putting it in trust for so and so unless for a minor."

He suggested the best place for a will is in a safety deposit box.

"Probate Court will keep it for \$3, or \$5 after July 1. Do not leave your will with your attorney."

THE REVISED Probate Code will legalize homemade wills. The will must be in the handwriting of the person making the will and it must be signed. No witnesses will be needed.

"Not now," he warned. "After July 1."

Instead of including the designation of personal items in a will, he suggested another plan. Make a separate list and have it attached to the will and a copy of the will.

It can have an explanation: "I am preparing a list of personal items and the names of those persons I would like to have them go. I direct my executor to carry out, so far as he is able, these bequests." Then list them individually.

"Probate was set up to protect the interests of widows, minors and the mentally incompetent," said the speaker. "The revised code provides that any party of interest can ask probate supervision."

He included examples from real life where second wives, husbands and selfish children had profited from poorly conceived wills and property management. The illustrations brought groans and mutterings from the audience.

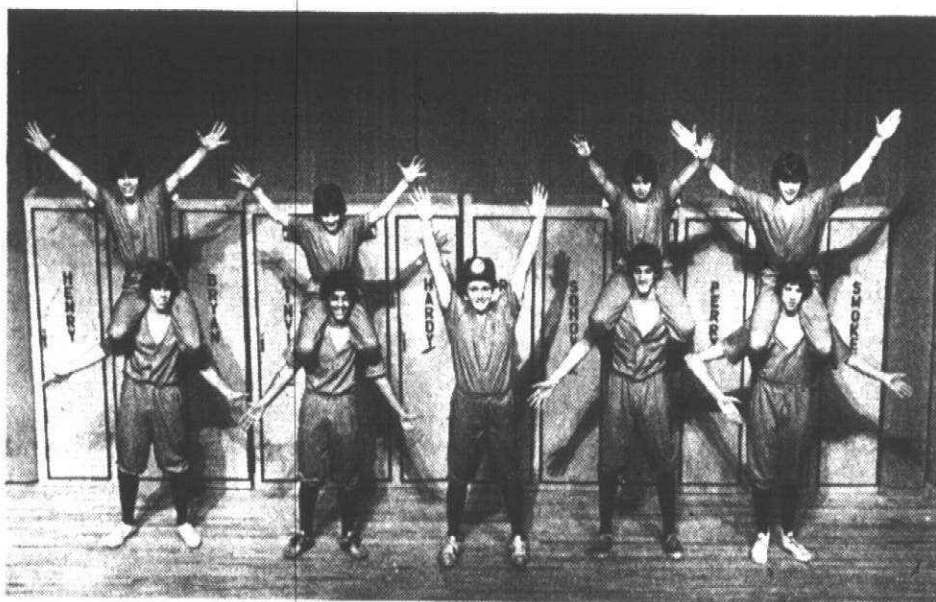

Kitchen Cabaret attracts a full house

Everyone roared with laughter when Larry Janes mentioned a battery-operated flour sifter — that is, until he demonstrated its practical use. Those who bake a lot of bread will be happy to know there is a gadget that will sift, automatically, 16 cups of flour per minute.

And the wonders of space-age cooking became reality as Vince McCallum, known as Mr. Microwave, demonstrated and explained microwave cooking technology.

These were just two of the treats in store for the 200 guests attending the Kitchen Cabaret sponsored by the Plymouth Symphony League.

The fund-raising event, Wednesday in the Plymouth Cultural Center, was

so successful that league members were encouraged to schedule it again next year.

BEGINNING with a Maurice salad luncheon, prepared and served by league members, cabaret-goers were offered opportunities to view displays set up by local merchants.

The Cheese and Wine Barn offered a tasting of a meat sauce product; Bed 'n' Stead showed the latest in its linen collection for the kitchen; the Potter's Wheel displayed handmade teapots and casseroles; and Plymouth Book World presented a wide variety of cookbooks.

Jan Repp, who chaired the event, introduced the three featured speakers-demonstrators. Mary Prince, a representative from the Chemex Corp. showed how you can make "the perfect

cup of coffee every time."

The pace livened when Larry Janes of the Gourmet Gallerie, and his assistant, Loretta Mirro, promised to, "dazzle your socks off with all the nifty gadgets" they brought with them.

Along with the battery-operated flour sifter, he showed how the Magic Mop can remove fat from gravies, sauces, and even can absorb grease out of the air in your kitchen.

For pasta lovers in the audience, the pasta machine rolled, then cut homemade noodles. A salad spinner whirled the moisture out of lettuce leaves and other salad greens.

Loretta Mirro, a professional home economist made a tempting stir-fry dish, cooked up an omelette, and showed how easy it is to make a crepe with a new electric appliance.

VALUABLE information about the knife-sharpening technique, again demonstrated by Janes, showed the proper angle (22½ degrees) for sharpening good cutlery. He told what to look for and how to purchase good knives for the kitchen.

Vince McCallum strived to emphasize the safety of conventional microwave cooking units.

Among other important facts, he said the units are closely regulated by the Federal Communications Commission. The frequency has been assigned by that commission, and is not any more dangerous than a CB radio.

He also emphasized that while persons think the unit is leaking if they see light around the seals, that is perfectly normal. The unit is not meant to be light-tight, or air tight. But it is micro-tight.

He revealed the only accident in 1978 involving a microwave unit (out of over 7,000 cooking-related accidents) was one in which a man dropped one on his foot in trying to transport it out to his patio.

"That," said McCallum, "will give you some idea as to the safety of the product."

He then went on to cook a head of

cauliflower in just 10 minutes. Again, he gave the audience a tip. The secret, he said, is in removing the core of the head to allow penetration of the microwave energy.

FOLLOWING the cooking demonstration, he asked for questions from the audience. The inevitable popcorn question gave rise to a lively discussion which ended with McCallum's recommendation to use a microwave popper, "unless you like a lot of unpopped kernels of corn." Uneven moisture content in the kernels is the main reason this

procedure presents difficulties to popcorn fanciers.

Twenty people went home with prizes ranging from a weekend for two at the Plymouth Hilton to a wooden bread box, inlaid with a leaded, stained glass design.

Other prizes included a dish garden, donated by Heide's, a casserole dish, "The Joy of Cooking" cookbook, a series of cooking classes, and a membership in a racquet club.

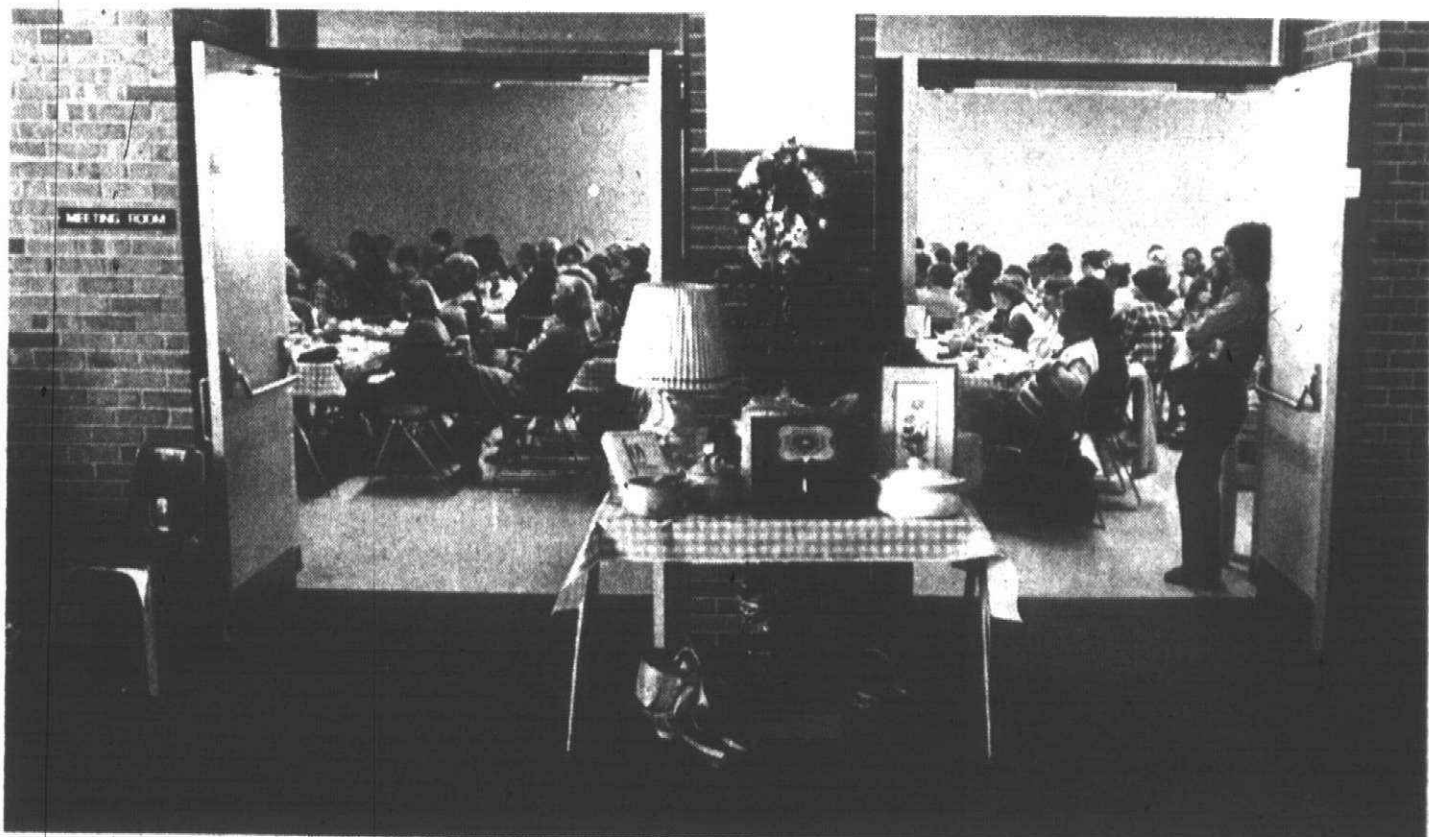

Bird sanctuaries worth flocking to in Canada, U.S.

If you think spring is for the birds, you should stand on the wet spring fields of Jack Miner's Bird Sanctuary in Kingsville, Ontario, when the Canada geese arrive.

They are flocking in now, in great winged clouds, circling down and stretching out their legs to land.

If you have ever seen photos of the Concorde landing at a major airport, you have seen a poor mechanical version of the Canada goose coming to a full screeching stop. The head stretches forward and the strong back legs take the momentum against the grass.

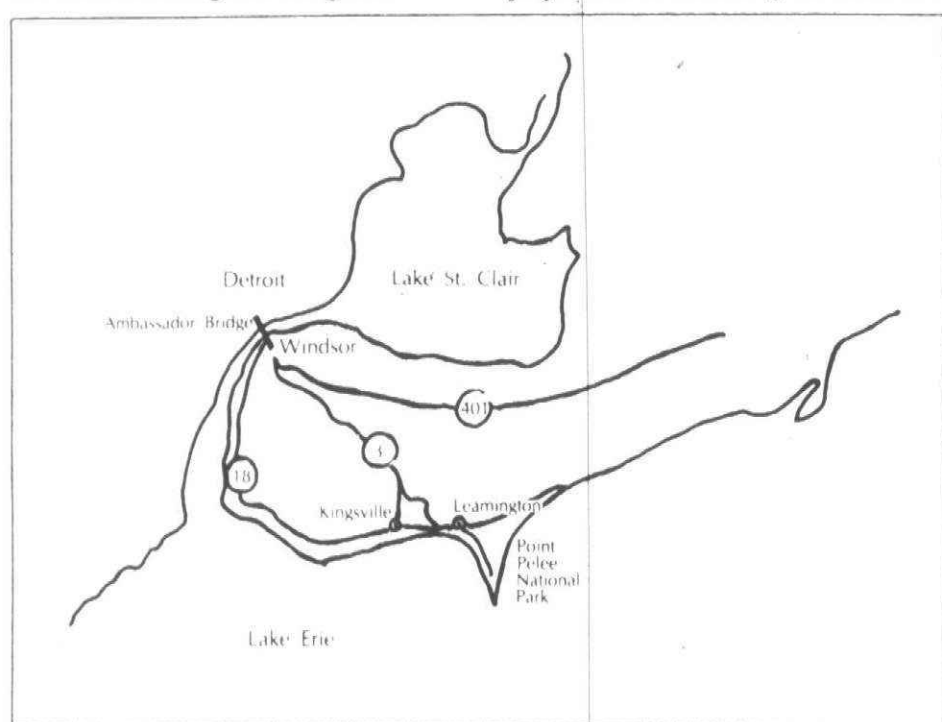
This bird experience is one of several available to bird lovers in nature centers and sanctuaries around southeast Michigan and lower Ontario this month.

Bird walks and owl prowls are scheduled in the Huron-Clinton Metro Parks, and a variety of programs are planned at the Kellogg Bird Sanctuary in Battle Creek and the Seven Pond Nature Center run by the Michigan Audubon Society in Dryden. The birds are also coming in to Point Pelee in Ontario.

in Kingsville, Ontario, which is on Highway 18, about 30 miles southeast from the Ambassador Bridge.

It was founded by Jack Miner and is now run by his sons, Manly and Jasper.

"The birds were so scarce in 1904 that my father used decoys to lure them in," Manly said. "By 1908 we had eleven geese, by 1909 there were 32, by 1910 there were 350 and now they come in by the thousands."

About 15,000 geese have come into the sanctuary already, on their way north to nesting grounds in Hudson Bay and James Bay. They will be in full force through April 15, according to Miner, who predicts a count of 20,000 birds this year.

"The best time to be here is between three in the afternoon and dark," Miner said. "Sometimes they go to the lake during the earlier part of the day."

The sanctuary is open from day-break to dark every day except Sunday, when the Miner family takes a day off. It will be open on both Good Friday and Easter Monday. There is no entrance fee. The sanctuary is supported by the Jack Miner Foundation, which accepts donations.

Although hunters have been known to wait in nearby woods during the fall

hunting season, the geese have learned to outwit them. They fly in high over the sanctuary and circle straight down to avoid the sound of guns.

"There has not been any excessive kill, so the flocks are still strong," Manly said.

"My father literally saved this bird from extinction. We have helped to start sanctuaries and nesting places in 110 places east of the Mississippi.

TWO MICHIGAN nesting places for Canada geese are Kensington Metro Park, which has a permanent year-round flock in the Huron River Valley and the Kellogg Bird Sanctuary in Battle Creek. Kensington Park Naturalist Pat Carlson says the migrants can be seen sometimes at the Nature Center and at the beach, although Kensington is on the edge of the flyway.

Kensington already has held its first public bird walk for the sighting of early songbirds and will hold a bird walk for beginners at 9 a.m. Sunday, April 29.

Additional bird walks are also planned for May. The park keeps a species list, which is available to the public, and records sightings by nature lovers who roam the park.

An Owl Prowl is the highlight of Stoney Creek Metro Park near Van Dyke and 28 Mile Road, which is also part of the Huron-Clinton Metro Park system.

This unique bird-watching experience begins at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, April 7, at the Nature Center, where naturalists Roger Bajorek and Bill Thomas will introduce the owl through a slide show.

Participants will then be taken to an area of the park where owl calls are played on a tape recorder, hopefully luring park owls out into the open.

"They will call back, and 90 percent of the time they will walk to within 30 feet of us," Bajorek said. "You can shine a flashlight in their eyes and they won't move."

Bajorek has a trained pet owl called Oscar, an active participant in the program. There is no fee for the owl prowl, but reservations are required.

The third metro park in the system, Oakwood Metro Park near Flat Rock, is a good place to see river ducks and egrets, under naturalist Bob Wittersheim's guiding.

Call the Detroit office of the Huron-Clinton Metro Parks for information about programs and the best time to see specific birds. The office is located at 3050 City National Bank Building, Detroit 48226, phone 961-5865.

Other bird experiences in the Michigan and nearby Ontario regions include:

- The spring bird migration spectacular at Point Pelee National Park, near Leamington, a few miles east of the Jack Miner Bird Sanctuary.

- The Kellogg Bird Sanctuary run by Michigan State University at Battle Creek.

- The Seven Pond Nature Center funded by the Michigan Audubon Society in Dryden, Mich.

- The area near Nankin Mills Nature Center, Edward Hines Park.

- Belle Isle, where bird-watchers have already seen a Red-Throated Loon and a Red-Necked Grebe this spring.

In short, the birds are making a welcomed return.

A bargain-basement booklet on flying cheaply

"How To Fly For Less," a consumer's guide to low-cost air charters and other travel bargains, is the kind of booklet that is hard to review but hard to ignore when information is so valuable to the traveler.

It is published by Travel Information Bureau, P.O. Box 105, Kings Park, N.Y. 11754 by Jens Jurgen. It looks like he publishes and distributes it himself, which means that no trade publisher has put a stamp of approval on it.

I can't find Jurgen's name in any travel writers' list, and there is no way to check his credentials or the accuracy of the booklet, but it seems to be a reasonable first step for someone trying to find his way through the morass of travel bargains this spring.

The booklet describes various regular, discount and charter flights available and tells you who to contact for flights to destinations in the U.S. and abroad.

It does not contain all the information you need, because schedules and fares change too fast to trust anything in print, but it will help you do your homework and give you new ideas. Follow up with inquiries to the places listed, as confirmation.

Jurgen stresses low-cost charter flights and explains advantages and disadvantages, as well as the precautions to take in this field.

Air travel, like any other major purchase, should be bought only after you have done some comparison shopping. Do it early so that you can act on your information well in advance of flight time. The guide includes information on scheduled flights at charter prices, public charters, last-minute bookings, special discounts, one-way trips, ticket combinations and other things. It includes a 1979 charter flight directory.

Area organizations listed include the Auto Club of Michigan; Elliott Tours, Inc., Farmington Hills; Ethnic Charter Center; General Travel and Charters; Mastrogianni Travel; Travel Charters Inc., and VIP Travel Service, Detroit; Hamilton, Miller, Hudson and Fayne Travel Corp. and Sky World Holidays, Southfield; Renald Attard, Allen Park; Travel Age Inc., Warren; Travel and C., Inc., Dearborn.

It also includes intriguing names like Performing Arts Abroad in Kalamazoo and Great Places in Ann Arbor.

The guide sells for \$3.75. Another, called "1,001 Sources of Free Travel Information," costs \$4.50. Both sell by mail from the Travel Information Bureau address.

Cooper, who began his film career while working as an Alaskan lumberjack, recently made a backpacking expedition around Hawaii to view that Pacific paradise as few have.

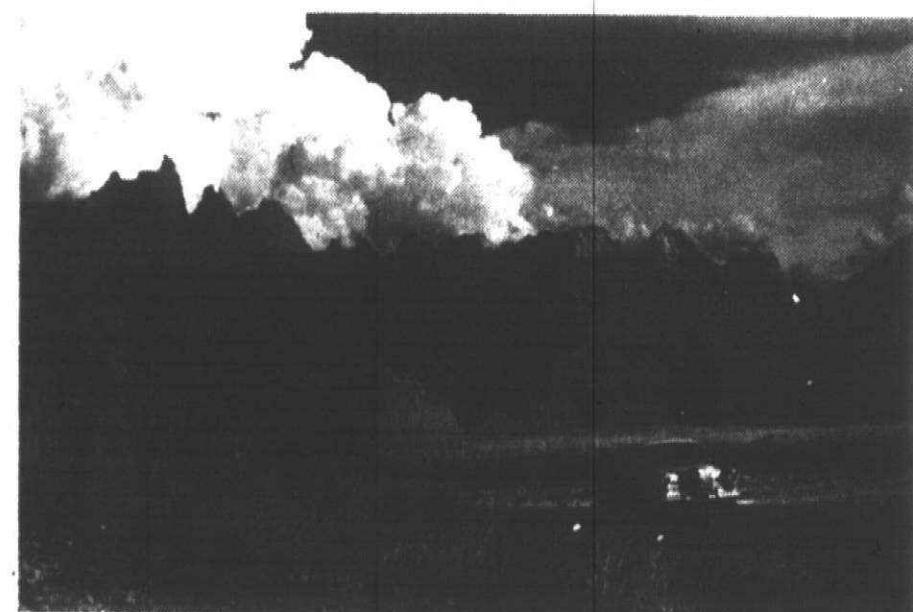
Aside from the familiar scenes of Waikiki Beach and Pearl Harbor, Cooper takes to remote trails in search of

Citation unveiled tomorrow



The company bills it as the first Chevy of the '80s, and it could well be the shape of cars of the next decade.

The Chevrolet Citation is smaller, lighter

CITATION

and more fuel-efficient than the car it replaces.

The Citation, to be unveiled at press conferences across the country tomorrow and to go on sale April 18, is the front wheel drive replacement for the Nova line. It is about 20 inches shorter and 800 pounds lighter than the Nova.

But more importantly, the new car gets far better mileage than its forerunner. With the standard 4-cylinder engine (90 horsepower) and 4-speed transmission, the Citation gets 24 miles per gallon in the city and 38 on the highway, according to the Environmental Protection Agency. The 1979 Nova was rated at 19

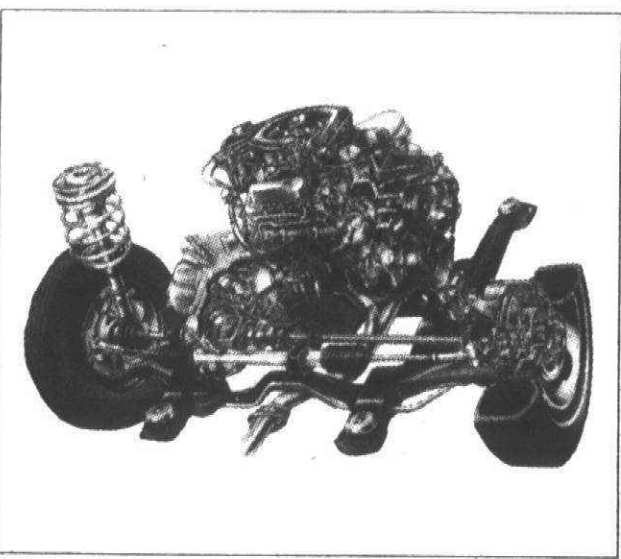
city and 28 highway. The Citation's figures represent a 32 percent increase over Nova's.

A 115-horsepower V-6 engine is an option, as is an automatic transmission.

Chevrolet General Manager Robert Lund said the new car has, "the exterior dimensions of a subcompact, the interior room of a mid-size car and as much luggage capacity as many full-size sedans."

The Citation will be available in three body styles — a two-door notchback, a two-door hatchback and a four-door hatchback. All the models have a 104.9 inch wheelbase.

The car has front disc brakes, rack and pinion steering and front MacPherson struts.
