Proposed rent subsidy units anger Pickwick

Residents of the 300-odd homes that comprise the Pickwick subdivision are worried.

They believe that an apartment and townhouse development offering subsidized rental units has been proposed for a site near their subdivision.

But if the Pickwick Homeowners Association has any thing to say about it, the complex will never be built.

Don Peterson, vice president of the association, said Friday that Pickwick homeowners plan to show up in force to object to subsidized housing when the

township board next meets May 1.

They are not officially on the agenda for that meeting, but want to use the public forum at the beginning of the session to state their views.

According to Peterson, Supervisor Noel Culbert has promised to put the subject on the May 8 meeting agenda. Culbert attended an April 26 meeting of the homeowners' group to discuss the proposed complex. He was not available Friday for comment.

Culbert said he intends to introduce a resolution that the township would no longer consent to subsidized rental

units because "we already have 12 percent more than the national average."

Peterson said the complex is proposed for an 18-acre parcel, east of Lilley and south of Warren. Amurcon, a Southfield development firm, has also filed an application to receive a mortgage guarantee from the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

According to Canton Planner James Kosteva, the company filed under a HUD section that would allow rent subsidies on some or all units for low and moderate income families.

"But the units don't have to be subsidized."

The tentative project has been outlined to township officials, but Amurcon has made no formal move yet to get planning commission and township board approval.

Kim Wilkins, an Amurcon representative, refused to confirm or deny anything in connection with the project.

The planned unit development (PUD) agreement for the area in question does allow multiple family dwellings, although some township zoning maps show the area parcel zoned for single

family houses. A PUD supercedes the zoning maps.

Peterson said the major objection to the proposed complex is that "there is enough rent subsidized housing in the community."

"I don't believe the majority of members in our group would object to luxury apartments in that area."

"My personal view is that people can holler 'what right do you have to say we can't come here,' but look at the other subsidized housing in Canton."

One example of a complex that offers rent subsidies is Canton Commons on Haggerty south of Cherry Hill. The

complex was built long before most of Canton's subdivisions. Peterson said Pickwick's opposition to the complex was not based on fear of minorities moving into the neighborhood.

"That wasn't even mentioned. If someone can afford to live in a certain area, that's fine."

Amurcon is also building a group of single and multiple family dwellings on Joy Road west of Sheldon.

"I just think people who have \$80,000 and \$90,000 houses have a right not to want rent-subsidized apartments next door," Culbert said.

Police move into new home

Police Chief Walter MacGregor says there's "no question" that the Canton Police Department will be able to function more efficiently now that old township hall has been converted into a station for the force.

Police department employees moved into the renovated facility last Wednesday after working in a cramped trailer parked behind the former township hall since the department's establishment in August, 1976.

Township office workers moved out of the building on Geddes near Michigan last fall following completion of the township's new three-story administration building on Canton Center near Proctor.

Work immediately began on the estimated \$175,000 project to convert the old administration building into a police station with prisoner holding cells, office space and a squad room for meetings.

MacGREGOR, said the new facility will eliminate trips to Plymouth, Wayne and Westland for purposes of jailing suspects and provide more privacy to police personnel.

The trailer that has housed the police department since 1976 contained no prisoner holding cells. MacGregor said Canton police officers were forced to transport prisoners to available jails in nearby communities for short stays.

"Now, of course, we have some privacy. In the other facility, we didn't have any," said MacGregor, referring to the paper-thin walls that divided offices in the trailer. He noted that occupants of one office could easily hear what was said in the next.


The chief expects that the new station will be able to accommodate the expanding police force for seven to 10 years. The township board probably will have to authorize the construction of another police station or an addition to the recently completed facility after that time, he said.

The trailer that has housed the police force until now will be used for storage and training sessions, according to the chief.

Mac Gregor will not work in the new facility for long, however.

At last week's township board meeting, MacGregor resigned from the force following a debate over the hiring of part-time officers.

On Thursday, MacGregor said he will stick to his decision to resign despite board approval of 10 part-time positions. His resignation takes effect on May 9.

Sludge hits the fan as demo gets dumped

A plan to show Canton residents how sludge would be composted at a proposed township site went awry last Thursday when Supervisor Noel Culbert changed his mind.

Following a planning commission meeting last week, Bi-Products Systems representative Al Hart announced that his company would be using the Township Hall parking lot to show how sludge is mixed with woodchips and eventually converted to an odorless soil additive.

Bi-Products Systems is seeking to gain approval for a plan to use 140 acres in Canton to conduct the sludge composting process. The company is under contract to the City of Detroit, which was recently ordered to find

other methods of disposing of sludge from its water and sewage treatment plant. The court order followed a lawsuit filed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

The demonstration of sludge composting was an attempt to prove to residents that the process would not create extreme odor or disruption.

But, a day after the company allegedly was given tentative approval by Culbert to hold the demonstration, the permission was withdrawn.

Hart said he would be at township hall Saturday, April 28, when the demonstration had been scheduled, to explain the cancellation. Culbert was attending a seminar and could not be reached for comment.

Area may be choice for outpatient facility

Henry Ford Hospital is looking at sites in the Plymouth-Canton area for a proposed outpatient facility.

According to Jane Eckles, a public relations officer for the hospital, a letter of intent to file a certificate of need was filed with the Southeast Michigan Comprehensive Health Planning Council.

Eckles says they have been "looking at two or three sites in Plymouth and Canton, but no options have been taken as yet."

A certificate of need, if filed, "tells the planners what we want and why and will demonstrate the need for a facility in that area," she said.

If the outpatient facility is built, it will be similar to facilities in West Bloomfield, Troy, and Dearborn, but will be on a smaller scale, according to Eckles.

The proposed facility would cost about \$3 million as compared to the others which cost \$6 million to build

DeHoCo fate hangs in court

State plans to construct a prison on Detroit House of Correction (DeHoCo) grounds in Northville Township settled half the question of the future of that institution.

Now neighboring residents and Wayne County officials are waiting to see if a court decision will force the county to take over the other half of the detention facility in Plymouth Township.

Northville's efforts to keep a new state prison from being built at the vacant Wayne County Child Development Center were rewarded last week as the state carried through on a compromise and instead purchased the former women's division of DeHoCo from the City of Detroit.

The state paid \$1.6 million for the deteriorating property and plans to spend another \$30 million to renovate the facility as a 550-bed, minimum-to-maximum security prison over the next three to five years.

However the majority of DeHoCo's 1,300 acres, which straddle the Five Mile boundary between the two townships from Beck to Napier, remain Detroit property, according to Bill Rucks, DeHoCo director.

The men's division south of Five Mile in Plymouth Township remains a Detroit lock-up for male inmates serving terms of one year or less.

A CIRCUIT COURT ruling to determine if Wayne County will be forced to take over the detention facilities is expected in mid-May, according to Coun-

ty Commissioner William Joyner (D-Plymouth), whose 27th District includes Plymouth and Canton.

"The county sued the City of Detroit and asked that they be enjoined from turning DeHoCo over to the county," explained Joyner, a member of the commissioners' corrections committee.

County feasibility studies relating to DeHoCo, the old Wayne County jail, and general hospital buildings were presented in court last Friday, according to Rucks.

Detroit has budgeted funds through September to operate the facility, says Joyner.

TWO YEARS AGO the Northville community galvanized into action when Gov. William Milliken proposed turning the sprawling Wayne County Child Development Center, unused since 1974, into a state prison.

Protests that the center was surrounded by residential property eventually helped sway the governor's decision. Instead the state opted to buy the vacant women's division of DeHoCo in Section 7 of the property.

Although DeHoCo is located largely in an unsettled area, surrounding zoning in Plymouth Township is designated for medium and high density residential construction, according to the township's future land use map.

The state rented the women's division for two years until August 1977, when female inmates were moved to a new prison in Ypsilanti. The deteriorating cottages that made up the women's

side have been unused since.

Although security was a constant problem when women were incarcerated at the facility, at least one state legislator may question the type of security system installed.

State Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, who also represents Plymouth and Livonia, said he expects the new prison to be a medium security facility despite published reports that minimum and maximum security prisoners would be sent there.

DeHoCo authorities refused to comment on the security plans.

three years ago, she said.

Eckles said that the proposed facility "will be different from established facilities. We do not want duplication of services."

Some of the services of the proposed Plymouth-Canton area outpatient facility would be optometry services, dentistry, minor surgery not requiring hospitalization, a 24-hour emergency room, a lab for patient testing, and an x-ray service, according to Eckles.

If Henry Ford Hospital develops a certificate of need for the proposed facility, it will be submitted to the council by June 1, she said.

Referral number added

Wayne County senior citizens will soon get improved telephone assistance for transportation and referral information, according to Arlander Flowers of the Detroit-Wayne County Information and Referral Service.

A new toll-free WATS number, 1-800-462-5178 has been added to the system.

The service provides senior citizens with telephone numbers for services such as transportation to doctors or direct them to a phone number of an

agency that can help them with a problem.

According to Flowers, the WATS number is an improvement over the old call-collect system.

The Detroit-Wayne County Information and Referral Service provides telephone information and referrals to residents of Wayne County.

The information and referral service is located at 2575 Cadillac Towers in downtown Detroit.

Bargain and rummage hunters will be pleased when the Canton Rotary Club holds its annual rummage sale May 19.


Proceeds from the rummage sale will be used in many projects of community service, according to the Rotary Club.

Union to support Schoolcraft millage request

Millage 'crucial'

The Faculty Forum, virtually inactive in the March 26 Schoolcraft College millage election, will strongly support a June 11 tax proposal.

"The June 11 election is crucial," said William G. Nickels, retiring president of the faculty union. "The Faculty Forum Senate (27 members) has acted unanimously in approving it."

The two-year community college is seeking a one mill increase in the property tax for one year. Half will be used for major maintenance and equipment purchases. The other half will be used to complete funding for a Culinary Arts Addition to the Waterman Campus Center.

NICKELS ADMITTED the Forum "wasn't very active" during the March

26 campaign, when the college sought one mill for five years for capital purposes.

"There's a lot of dirty laundry, and I just don't want to air it," Nickels said in an interview. All he would reveal is that faculty members questioned the need for a new learning resources center when they consider the present library as seriously underfunded.

The new proposal will yield nearly \$2 million for one year, if approved. "It won't be used for salaries," Nickels said.

"The buildings are in need of maintenance. Electrical systems need to be re-done. Steel doors are rusting.

"There has been no major new automotive technology equipment since the building was built. They're using the same equipment that was here when I came in 1968.

"The culinary arts program could expand its enrollment. The registrar's office would get some space in the move. The registrar has been in a 'temporary' building since the 1960s."

THE FORUM won't join the millage steering committee, headed by the chairman and vice chairman of the board of trustees — Paul Kadish and Harry Greenleaf.

Instead, Nickels said, the Forum will send a mailing to 2,500 members of the Michigan Education Association who live in the Schoolcraft College district, informing them of its endorsements of the millage and board of trustees candidates. Faculty members will also work at the polls, he said.

The Forum, an MEA affiliate union, has about 160 full-time members and

about the same number of part-time instructors.

The college district includes the K-12

districts of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville and Plymouth-Canton.


Chiefs edge Churchill in error filled game



Daniel's Den Sage of Mecosta

A book came across my desk recently which I should read. But I'm not going to.

I'm not going to read it because it's fiction and it's about ghosts, enchantment, phantoms and fiends.

I should read it because the author is Russell Kirk, a native of Plymouth who has gained a national reputation as a columnist and author.

But Kirk no longer lives in Plymouth. He's residing in Mecosta, a long ways from here.

Besides, I prefer to read nonfiction — history, biographies, and autobiographies. When I do get around to reading fiction, it's not of the ghost, phantom and fiend variety.

KIRK IS STILL a very active writer, even though he's 70 years old. He was born in Plymouth in 1908.

Kirk has written 20 books and several hundred essays, short stories and other publications. Besides his syndicated column, Kirk writes a monthly page on education for *National Review* and is editor of *The University Bookman*, a quarterly journal. His syndicated column appears in more than 200 newspapers.

The author's best-known book, *The Conservative Mind*, might well be the highlight of his writing career. The book is often discussed by those interested in political theory and is used often by political science professors for supplemental reading.

Some of his other better-known works include *Eliot And His Age*, a definitive account of that poet's life and works, and *The Roots of American Order*, which is Kirk's affirmation of faith in American institutions and ideals.

ALTHOUGH KIRK primarily is recognized as a conservative philosopher, political historian, and literary critic, he also is developing a reputation as an author of supernatural material.

That came as a bit of a surprise to me as I have known of Kirk only as a writer in the field of history and political science.

So I was interested in the following book review material summarizing Kirk's supernatural writings:

"In his all-too-infrequent role as the Master Necromancer of Mecosta, Mich., Dr. Kirk has conjured up a mysterious Gothic realm of renevants and wraiths, of phantoms and fiends, of the diabolical and the divine.

"The sinister ambience of the classic ghost story is revived with disquieting dexterity in such terrify-

ing narratives as 'Sorworth Place' and 'Ex Tenebris,' in which dark powers from the netherworld return to lurk through the land of the living

"An ancient Roman emperor returns, too, in 'The Last God's Dream,' amidst sepulchral surroundings in the legend-haunted town of Split, while yet another ghostly town in the American Midwest is invoked in 'There's a Long, Long Trail a-Winding,' winner of the 1977 World Fantasy Award."

A general comment on Kirk's writings in this area is: "The uncanny tales of Russell Kirk are superbly wrought literary entertainments, but also profound ruminations upon the age-old reality of evil, the darkness or the light in souls, the mysteries of human existence. For a few pages here and a few pages there, Dr. Kirk obliterates the very boundaries between natural and supernatural, and attains thereby a vision of the eternal, a glimpse into a timeless realm."

I'm not much interested in those boundaries, but in case you are, Kirk's latest book is entitled, "The Princess of All Lands." The book is tagged as a story about a young woman "abducted into a demonic domain of depravity and terror, and then confronted by a veritable cosmic encounter between the ethereal and the damned."

Although I'm not interested in the supernatural, Kirk obviously is. In the prologue, he writes:

"Time was, not long ago, when most folk possessed their incredulity at any ghostly relation. But nowadays people seem eager to believe in even the most unlikely revenant. My uncanny tales in this present collection, though fanciful, also are true: true in the sense that at the heart of each of them lies some core of real experience (mine, or that of friends), and truer in the sense that these stories may touch upon the darkness or the light in souls

"Have I ever seen a ghost? Why, I am one, and so are you — a *geist*, a spirit, in a mortal envelope. Why did I write these sepulchral fantasies? Why, partly to remind you and myself that we are spirits in prison; and mainly in the hope of discomforting an old man on a winter's night, or a girl in the bloom of her youth.

"I have dwelt in haunted houses, and I have prepared a chamber for you. If I conjure up in you a dreadful joy, like that of a small boy on a secret stair, my malice will be satisfied."

In that interests you, by chance, than the publisher for Kirk's latest tale is Arkham House Publishers, Inc., Sauk City, Wis.

Chester's famous catch

All in all, spring is overrated. I can't understand how people get excited about a time of year when it rains 10 days out of 15. But one of the nice things about the season is the return of fishing.

People fish through the ice in the winter, true. But ice fishing resembles real fishing the way the Winter War resembles chess — the broadest concepts are similar, but one is a lot more comfortable than the other. Only sick people really enjoy ice fishing.

Smelt and perch, the proletariat of the piscatorial world, are the first legal catches of the spring. They're first, but they're dull; how much of a thrill can there be in dipping a net into 41-degree water several hundred times a night? Or flopping 50 perch — the state limit — onto the bank before noon?

Both fish move in schools about the size of a subaqueous Manhattan, so catching them is actually much easier than not catching them. Still, it's red-beans-and-rice fishing — satisfying, but not exactly memorable. But they're two of the few kinds of fish that are legal to catch in the spring, when most gamefish are spawning.

So, if legal niceties bother you, smelt and perch are just about the only things you can fish for.

NOT EVERYONE is bothered by such niceties.

I grew up two blocks from the Detroit River. If you grow up across the street from a baseball stadium, I guess your heroes are center fielders — mine was a guy I thought was the world's best marine engine mechanic, and Chester the fisherman.

Chester was a professional fisherman. There aren't many of those people around, and fewer still in Detroit. And even fewer of them who weigh in at about 280 pounds and still manage to habitually dig up Sears workpans five or six sizes too large.

But Chester — whose last name I never learned — was unusual in more ways than one.

The fish he caught professionally were minnows. He sold them to bait stores at 15 cents or a quarter a dozen so that you could buy them for 50 or 60 cents a dozen. In the minnow business, "a dozen" is a euphemism for what looks like a healthy number of the little suckers. Nobody counts them.

And he had a 15½ foot solid steel boat that weighed in at a good 200 pounds. In the bow he kept a 55-gallon oil drum filled with probably another 200 pounds of water. Add a few dozen pounds of minnows to the drum, on good days.

All of this, and Chester, too — who weighed more than the boat — were pushed around the river by a 20-horsepower Johnson outboard engine that would never have even have seen V-J Day if it hadn't been for my other boyhood hero, the marine mechanic.

He also had a hand in keeping Chester's car alive. It was a black, 1954 Chevrolet that made a series of the greatest comebacks since Lazarus.

YOU COULD see Chester coming back from minnow netting forays into Lake St. Clair when he was still maybe a mile from the lighthouse that marks the point where the Lake flows into the River. His boat wasn't hard to spot — that 55-gallon drum in the bow made it look like a miniature iron ore freighter.

When you saw him you knew you had time to do just about anything you wanted to before he made it back to the docks. After you spotted him, all that weight in front of that puny outboard gave him an

estimated time of arrival of about 90 minutes.

Chester was on the water five or six hours a day, so his face was the color of expensive Cordovan English walking shoes. He also had terrible sinuses. Somewhere in the depths of those pants he kept one of the cloths mechanics use to sop up grease. Every few minutes he'd rummage around until he found it, then noisily blow his nose.

Still, none of this had anything to do with his professional life. He was a truly great fisherman.

Although illegal.

Chester didn't chase minnows. He parked in some likely looking place and waited for them to come to him, checking on their progress with the net every now and then. In the meantime, he fished with rod and reel.

Chester pulled an Atlantic salmon out of the Detroit River in 1966, when there weren't supposed to be any Atlantic salmon east of Boston.

WHEN CHESTER caught that salmon, he didn't have the faintest idea what it was. At Tommy's Boat Livery they kept a very large book full of color photos of fish, but nobody'd used it in years — when you've seen one perch, you've seen them all.

The book was on a shelf above the mounted head of the third largest muskie caught in the history of mankind.

Chester pulled that big book down and started leafing through it. When he saw a picture that looked like the fish — which he had spread out on his lap below the book for easy reference — he stopped and compared. And when he found a picture that said Atlantic Salmon, he'd found the brother of the fish on his workpans.

Big excitement was the result. Newspapers were called, and surprisingly enough they came and took pictures. And brought with them some guys from the Department of Natural Resources.

This presented a problem to Chester, who had 40 or 50 pounds of illegal walleye in his boat. The season on them was still closed, but when you can fillet them and get \$1.25 a pound for the result, you don't let legal niceties bother you. At least, not if you're Chester.

The boys from the DNR, however, were much more bothered by such minor scupules.

As far as I know, Chester was the first person to ever catch an Atlantic salmon in the Detroit River. In exchange, he also got to be the only guy I know who said "fishing" when his cellmate asked what he was in for.

The illegal walleye drew him a three-day sentence.

So, perch and smelt may not be those exciting things to catch, but they beat the hell out of lighting matches and writing your initials with soot on the ceiling of a county cell.

Who would have thought that it could be renovated into one of the most fashionable furniture stores in the area? The Plymouth Furniture people did and its zig-zag design is superb.

Most people would have kept the big room's rectangular shape. But not the new group. They came up with an interior display that is eye-catching.

And you surely remember Lou Goddard, the fellow who conceived the mini-mall idea at the corner of Main Street and Ann Arbor Trail before he retired to Arizona.

Lou had sold his manufacturing business and purchased what used to be the old 5,10 and 25 cent store. Figuring that several tenants would be better than one, he revamped the building's interior and, as a result, Plymouth had the first mini-mall in the area.

AND IT TOOK a lot of imagination to picture Forest Mall, the series of small shops that have become popular with women shoppers.

Only a group with imagination could have thought of that. But Plymouth has it, and it now being copied in the western suburbs.

Remember the Mayflower Hotel in '50s with its big, bare coffee shop and a dining room, highlighted only by the pictures of the Pilgrims in New England?

Well, Ralph Lorenz turned his imagination loose and changed the area into something new. He rebuilt the cold-looking coffee shop into what is now The Steak House — one of the most popular dining places around. He then tore out an old kitchen and installed what he chose to call The Crow's Nest. It is a replica of an old English Pub. And he had large beams put in the dining room to give added effect.

In 1945, Antoinette Slovik received word from the Army that her husband, Eddie had died.

So Eddie Slovik's widow applied for Army benefits. The Army never explained to her how her husband died. But after receiving her application for benefits they informed her that she was ineligible for them.

She was told she must send his last paycheck back to the Army. She did. It wasn't until 1953 that she learned the reason she was denied her husband's benefits by the Army.

Her husband was the first soldier since the Civil War to be executed for desertion. She discovered the whole truth not from the Army but from a writer who wanted to interview her for a book he intended to write about her husband's case.

Eddie Slovik's death and his widow's financial predicament went unnoticed for a good many years until about four years ago when a television movie was based on the incident.

That's how Roman Ulman became involved in her cause.

ULMAN, 36, is the head of the Polish Central Citizens Committee, which is trying to raise \$5,000 to pay Mrs. Slovik's medical bills. The 64-year-old woman is in a Detroit nursing home suffering from cancer, emphysema and several other complaints.

"I guess she's in pretty bad shape," said Ulman of Mrs. Slovik.

"She's not old but her condition is bad.

"I guess when you lose the will to live and self-dignity then there is a tendency to age," he said.

After Ulman saw the movie he became interested in a movement to have a bill passed in Washington allowing Mrs. Slovik to collect the Army benefits that she would have normally received plus interest.

In 1945, she would have received \$10,000 from the Army. After 34 years at 6 ¼ percent interest she has the chance to receive \$76,000.

Part of the bill introduced in February, 1979 which would allow her to receive that money stipulates that a percentage of the sum is nontaxable.

The bill is pending before the House Judiciary Committee. If it wins their approval, the bill will make it to the floor of the Senate and then move on to the House of Representatives.

MEMBERS OF Sen. Donald Riegle's staff speculate the bill might make it out of the Senate by July 1, 1979. The bill has won the support of President Jimmy Carter and is cosponsored by Sen. Ted Kennedy.

Comments from the Army and the Veterans' Administration are necessary for the consideration of the bill. Despite a grass roots feeling in the Detroit area that those two organizations don't want Mrs. Slovik to receive any money, Riegle staffer John Graykowski said he expects their comments to be favorable.

But for Ulman, the legal efforts in Washington have taken "too damn long."

Bogged down by poverty and ill health, Mrs. Slovik needs help in paying for her medical bills. She sold her home and for a while lived in a motel in Redford.

"I want her to have something in life," said Ulman.

The Polish Central Citizens Committee recently began helping tide over Mrs. Slovik until the legal maneuvering ends.

Money they collect will go directly to her debtors. The committee doesn't want to collect a lot of money. They just want enough to pay her bills so she has one less worry.

Somehow it seems fitting the committee is the group trying to help her immediate needs.

THE COMMITTEE was founded in 1917 to recruit Polish Americans to fight in World War I. At that time, Poland didn't exist on the map, a situation not wholly unusual in the history of that country.

After the war, the committee began to lobby President Woodrow Wilson to help create a new Poland through the Treaty of Versailles.

In recent times, the group, an umbrella organization for about 100 other Polish organizations, has expanded its efforts from the political to the cultural arena, according to Ulman.

The group is soliciting funds from Polish American businessmen and just about anyone else who wants to contribute to help Mrs. Slovik.

"We want to keep her up to her ears in welfare," Ulman said.

Those sentiments are echoed by Hamtramck businessman Henry Kozak, who owns a distributing firm.

"I'm pro-Mrs. Slovik," he said.

"Two people don't get convicted for a crime if one didn't have any part in it. She's living in the shadow of her husband

"She's up to her ears in bills. She's virtually destitute," adds Kozak, a former state senator.

THE GROUP HAS already raised \$1,000 toward their goal. Contributions can be sent to the Antoinette Slovik Fund, 3000 Town Center, Suite 2700, Southfield, 48075.

Merit of trips is debated

More than 120 U.S. lawmakers traveled at government expense during the recent Easter break of the 97th Congress.

Taxpayers will pay close to \$3 million for the trips, according to US News & World Reports magazine.

During the 12-day holiday they visited places like Peking, Jamaica, Great Britain and the Middle East (to name but a few).

Some lawmakers who decided to stay behind and visit their home districts said they wouldn't be surprised if the expense far exceeds \$3 million.

However, most elected officials say the money is well spent because of the need for congressmen and senators to become acquainted with global conditions that affect U.S. legislation and policy. Others say there are some cases that leave one hard pressed to justify dollars spent.

Here are the vacation stories of local congressmen, those who flew and those who stayed behind, prior to their returning to their respective hot seats in the nation's capitol last week.

U.S. REP. WILLIAM BRODHEAD D-Detroit

According to Brodhead's aide, Phil Jordan, this congressman sounds like one of the few purists in the bunch: "He's never taken one of those trips — those junkets," Jordan said. "He just doesn't believe in them himself."

Brodhead spent his break time consulting with his constituents and hosting an open house meeting in Detroit. His district includes Redford Township, Detroit, Southfield, Farmington, Farmington Hills and Lathrup Village.

Brodhead says he uses such break-times to get in touch with "two elements that get neglected" when Congress is in session — his family and the concerns of his district.

Never having gone on one of these overseas trips, Brodhead says he doesn't exactly know what goes on. However, he is skeptical when he learns of congressional trips to California or Puerto Rico.

"I think some of these trips taken are just vacations," he says. "I think it's very substantially overdone."

However, like most questioned, he agrees there are exceptions to every rule, like visits to Russia or China, where developing foreign relations and trade is high priority to the United States.

Brodhead considers the travels of the Select Committee on Narcotics as the most questionable trip. The 25 mem-

bers of that group "traveled all around the world," visiting 11 countries last year, he said. Some of the high spots included the Middle East, Far East, Columbia and northern Africa.

"As far as I know, they haven't produced any legislation or recommended legislation in that time," he says.

Brodhead suggested these committee members hike down to "certain college campuses," as well as the hearts of New York City or Detroit for drug trafficking information.

U.S. REP. WILLIAM FORD D-Taylor

Jetting back into Washington last week, Ford was one of those travelers visiting the People's Republic of China. Ford represents Wayne County, including the communities of Westland, Garden City and Livonia. In Congress he's chairperson of the Post Education Subcommittee, as well as a member on various education and labor committees.

Ford's administrative aide last week said the congressman had plans to meet with Chinese education officials while visiting that country. The aide said Ford was among seven committee members from the Education and Labor Committee that made the trip.

U.S. REP. CARL PURSELL D-Plymouth

Pursell also was among those visiting China and Japan. His aide, Bill Kerans, said the visits were about 8-to-2 on a ratio of work to pleasure. Pursell is a member of the Employment Opportunity Subcommittee and the Education and Labor Committee. Pursell's Michigan district includes Monroe, Washtenaw and Wayne Counties including the cities of Plymouth and Livonia.

"I think if you can't justify it publicly, you have no business going," Kerans said, referring to congressmen's traveling expenses.

Kerans said that the People's Republic of China was one of the prime travel spots this season, most obviously, because of normalization of relations between that country and the United States. With that in mind, legislators are traveling to that country to get firsthand knowledge of future trade deals, as well as to determine what this will mean to U.S. relations with Taiwan.

One of Pursell's reasons for taking the trip, Kerans said, was to assess the prospect of increased trade between the two nations and its effect on U.S. employment, as well as the balance of payments.

According to Keran, Pursell had a few local businesses in mind whose owners expressed interest in trade with China, such as an Ann Arbor-based electronics firm.

Keran says Pursell has been involved in discussions concerning U.S. steel producers and upcoming trade policies involving Japan.

Keran justifies the trip by saying Pursell is looking at the possibility of cultural and educational exchanges between the States and the People's Republic of China. Thinking in terms of his own district, Keran says Pursell views Eastern Michigan University and the University of Michigan as two institutions that could benefit from the normalization with student exchanges.

This was Pursell's first trip to China.

U.S. REP. WILLIAM BROOMFIELD R-Birmingham

Broomfield, a member of Congress for more than 20 years, traveled no farther than Birmingham this Easter break. He held appointments and made appearances, one of which before the Bloomfield Hills Lions Club.

However, in the past, Broomfield has traveled overseas, most memorably during the Ford Administration following the recognition of the People's Republic of China.

"I just don't have any apologies for the trips I've taken," he said.

A year ago he traveled to the Middle East, taking in such stops as Israel, Egypt, Jordan and Saudi Arabia.

Included in that Congressional tour was a stop in Iran. Broomfield said neither he nor members of his traveling group detected opposition brewing against the now-ousted Shaw of Iran.

Broomfield also pointed to some overseas visits as being far removed from pleasure trips, such as his tour of Pakistan several years ago. Visiting programs in that country, he was caught in the midst of an anti-American demonstration and attack on his car.

"For any person dealing in the area of foreign policy, travel is extremely important," Broomfield asserted.

"We go any place we feel we have to go," he said, adding such trips give congressman firsthand knowledge on where the billions of dollars of foreign aid are spent.

However, he did agree that "a number of trips could be classified as having minimal value. One example he cited was the study of postal services abroad."

I just couldn't imagine the justification," he said. "Those are the kinds of

areas that give the Congress a black eye."

U.S. SEN. DONALD REIGLE JR. D-Michigan

Reigle did not travel to the People's Republic of China this time around. Rather, his itinerary included stops around the state, including Detroit, Grand Rapids, Dearborn, Kalamazoo and Saginaw. Included in previous visits, however, were visits to Panama in late '77 and to the People's Republic of China prior to the normalization announcement.

"Anyone who went on the trip to the

Panama Canal knows that was no picnic," said staffer Doug Dibbert.

He said overseas visits are money well spent because Michigan ranks second among U.S. exporting states.

U.S. SEN. CARL LEVIN D-Michigan

According to Levin's office, Michigan's junior senator spent the Easter recess in Michigan, as well as on a three-day stop in California. A member of the Armed Services Committee, Levin toured various military submarine installations. It was a fact-finding mission to gather information about

the ELF underwater communications system proposed for Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

As of Saturday night, however, he was returning to the States from the Panama Canal zone where he was meeting with American canal workers and Panamanian and American dignitaries. He was accompanied by two aides and a staffer of the armed services committee.

Levin is responsible for managing the implementation of the Panama treaties. It was a two-day mission and his first trip abroad at government expense since taking office.

The guidelines for payment

Trying to find out the incurred expenses of globe-trotting legislators becomes a lesson of government in motion — "slow" motion.

The consensus appears to be that legislators traveling abroad are allowed \$75 for daily expenses. When traveling with a committee or other U.S. constituency, then a military plane is put at their disposal.

The expenses of some 120 lawmakers traveling abroad hit some \$3 million, according to magazine articles. Some legislators view that as a conservative estimate. Committee cost accounts are not due in until June. They are reported quarterly to the House and Senate.

Attempting to find accountability in government became a congressional shuffle. Here are the side-steps involved in the little dance number.

With your right foot out, you begin with the committee office. Take the Labor-Education Committee, for example. There you're told the state department has the listing of the expenses incurred and the military keeps records of flight expenses.

At the State Department, friendly office personnel refer you to the secretary of the Senate, for the traveling expenses of senators. There, you're told the State Department's travel bureau keeps such information. And in the State Department's travel bureau, you're turned right around and told the information should be available at the committee level.

A State Department public information officer says that until recently, there's been little interest in the traveling expenses of U.S. legislators. He attributes the recent interest as generated by heightened press coverage.

He also says today trend is that "nobody (meaning legislators) wants to be caught spending money."

"I think there are some changes and they are fairly clear around here," he adds. "Cost consciousness has set into Washington."

Plymouth - Past & Present

Battle on booze

Life on a farm in Plymouth Township in the 1830s was not always pleasant.

Lettie Teeple, who was born here in 1829, recalled one cold winter's day when she suddenly came across the carcasses of several hogs her father had just butchered.

"There was nothing at that time that looked more horrible to me," she wrote, "than dressed hogs with their bloody throats. For a long time after, I was haunted by those stiff porkers. Parents should be careful in this matter to prevent small children from being frightened."

But life on a farm in those days could have its attractive aspects, too. Lettie wrote, rather poetically, about the wild flowers, the green fields, and "the lofty forest-trees which appeared to be bowing to each other when the wind blew."

She remembered a visit to Grandfather Teeple's barn where she heard preaching for the first time. "The barn was all set up for the meeting," she wrote. "The minister took his place and commenced the ceremonies."

"It was the first religious meeting I ever heard. The minister talked loud, and looked fierce, and I was afraid. I got as close as I could to father."

In 1836, against the wishes of his wife, Mr. Teeple moved the family to the Grand River country. Lettie, who married and moved to the West Coast, died 68 years ago in Seattle.

Her story was contained in a manuscript published in 1974 in "Michigan History," a quarterly published by the Michigan Department of State. It was edited by Professor John H. Yzenbaard, of Western Michigan University, and John Hoffman, former editor of the quarterly.

Women in Social Reform

One hundred years ago, Plymouth possessed one of the most active chapters of the Women's Christian Temperance Union in Wayne County.

Of the 50 county conventions held between 1879 and 1929, Plymouth hosted eight of them; only Detroit hosted more.

Either the saloon problem here was greater than in surrounding villages or,

as is more likely, the women in Plymouth exhibited greater zeal in their efforts to combat John Barleycorn.

The local chapter was founded on May 13, 1877. Two years later a countywide convention was held here in the First Methodist Episcopal Church. Frances Willard, the organization's corresponding secretary, came here from Chicago to address the meeting.

The WCTU did more than labor against the evils of liquor. It secured the appointment of matrons in prisons. It lobbied for separate prisons for women. It made the sale of tobacco to minors illegal. But, as Phoebe Patterson wrote in her history of the local chapter:

"Our ultimate aim was the prohibition of the liquor traffic, and equal suffrage for women."

The League of Women Voters is said to be a direct descendant of the WCTU.

Among the women who stood out in the activities of the WCTU in Plymouth were Jennie Voorhies, Mrs. E.L. Beals, Clara Frisbie, Mrs. Patterson, and her daughter, Clara Todd.

Mrs. Voorhies, mother of Paul Voorhies who became attorney general of Michigan in the 1930s, was president of the chapter for 10 years.

Voorhies remembered that his mother had him distribute WCTU circulars when he was a boy. She didn't trust other boys to do the job. Instead of passing out the flyers they would hide them under the board sidewalks then used in the best sections of the village.

Mrs. Patterson, who served as president of the chapter, also was its recording secretary for 25 years. She became Michigan's first justice of the peace, and was the chief figure in a celebrated court case in the 1920s which involved the rights of women.

Her daughter, Clara Todd, succeeded her mother as recording secretary, and continued in that capacity for another 30 years.

In promoting temperance education, the WCTU women engaged in mass meetings, pledge signings, Bible readings, cottage prayer meetings, house-to-house visitations to those who imbibed, visits to those in jail, and evangelistic services.

They were not popular with everyone in the community, but the women

in Plymouth who kept the local chapter going in the face of stiff opposition from distillers, brewers, saloon owners and other vested interests deserve recognition for their courage and perseverance.

Women in Education

Among women who were prominent in the educational field in the Plymouth area were Ella Chaffee, who became the first high school principal here in 1881, Ann Smith, who taught here for 40 years and was in charge of the local public library for a quarter of a century until she retired at age 70 in 1953.

2 earn research grants

Two Wayne State University professors who live in Plymouth will receive research grants through the WSU Faculty Research Awards Program.

Andrea S. Vivian and Marc K. Krumm were among 47 WSU faculty members who were awarded a total of more than \$160,000 for basic research projects.

Vivian, an assistant professor of clinical pharmacy, was awarded \$2,163. The topic of her research is "Determination and Quantification of the Diuretic Properties of Theophylline."

Krumm, an assistant professor of history, plans to study parties and politics in North Carolina from 1844-1865 with a grant of \$3,390.

Vivian and Krumm were selected by a 23-member faculty screening committee from 109 applicants.

The Bottom Line How to cover

If your business is a small one, with only a few employees, one extra summer person might suffice. A larger concern could use more. Your business needs will determine the right number.

An excellent source of this summer help is local high schools and colleges. These summer part-timers and fill-ins are generally energetic and willing to learn.

Although they frequently require close supervision because of unfamiliarity with the position, you might even find some with related career goals who would be particularly interested in learning your business.

No special recordkeeping is involved, either. In fact, if the student indicates on his or her Form W-2 that no federal income taxes were owed last year and none are expected this year, you won't even have to withhold federal income taxes. You will have to withhold Social Security taxes, however.

If special skills are required for the vacant position, you might consider using one of the many temporary help

services. These agencies will screen and test applicants for your particular needs. The persons they send you will be on their payrolls, not on yours, so no payroll records are necessary. You simply record the fee as a business expense.

Another advantage is that you will not have to spend time or money advertising, interviewing, screening, checking references or testing applicants for positions which will last only a few days or weeks. And you will avoid misunderstandings.

DON'T OVERLOOK the possibility of hiring your own children if they are suitable. This arrangement can be beneficial in several ways.

First, working in the family business can give the youngsters a feel for the business, help them appreciate the amount of work required to keep it going, and prepare them for possible future partnership or ownership.

Second, you will have trusted employees with a stake in the success and growth of the firm.

Diaster threatens in tacky remake of, 'The Hurricane'

Spring seems to be the season of disasters, with floods, tornadoes and even radioactive fallout. Now there's one more calamity at hand, the Dino De Laurentiis production of "The Hurricane" (PG).

Mia Farrow plays a proper Bostonian gone randy in Pago Pago over a sexy Samoan played by Ex-surfer Dayton Ka'Ne. Ka'Ne, soon to start work on "Shark Boy of Bora Bora," has the cut of a lovely, brown-toned John Travolta. Farrow, more affected by the wind and rain, looks like a drowned mouse through much of the movie.

One reviewer described "The Hurricane" as "one torrid love affair and one bang-up hurricane." Oddly enough, the adjectives can be reversed.

Even the stern, tough navy captain (Jason Robards) can't keep his daughter (Farrow) in check, not to mention the natives or the weather. Nor is there exemplary moral conduct or support from the local priest (Trevor Howard) who has succumbed to drink.

(Haven't we seen Trevor Howard in this role before? Or was it Walter Huston? Or do all boozy missionaries look alike?)

THE ELEMENTS fare better at the hands of cinematographer Sven Nykvist who captures the sensuous beauty of the tropical atoll. The actual location was Bora Bora.

THE WIND and rain come (How much energy does it take to run all those wind machines?) and the world turns into a soggy spectacle. The sun emerges for a bit and then the big blow starts. Be assured, \$22 million worth of wind and rain is a lot of wind and rain.

"THE HURRICANE" is a substantially revamped version of the John Ford epic made in 1937, just as another recent film, "The Champ," is a remake of a 1931 film with Wallace Beery and Jackie Cooper. Both originals are interesting within the context of their own era, but they are not cinematic equivalents of Shakespearean plays.

Why reprocess such slight, trivial material? These remakes, like numerous others, appear to be further instances of Hollywood turning inward and backward to cannibalize old films for new profits.

Revamping called for in Oscar categories

Some afterthoughts on the Academy Awards — why was Maggie Smith, who won an Oscar for Best Supporting Actress, nominated in that category? Whom was she supporting?

Why isn't there a category for animated feature films? Walter Lantz received a special award for his overall contribution in animated films, but there is no category for feature-length animated films. Thus, the merits of such movies as "Watership Down," "Lord of the Rings," "The Rescuers" and others go unrecognized.

Can anyone remember the five songs nominated for awards? The best-song competition has fallen flat on its keyboard for some time. The lackluster caliber of this year's entries was underscored when Sammy Davis and Steve Lawrence entertained with a musical medley of outstanding songs which never won awards.

It would be better to abolish or in lean years omit the category rather than continue a charade that dilutes the award's value.

The deep ugly scars on its mighty trunk reveal that it was struck at least 14 times by lightning bolts.

For more than 400 years, the tree withstood the force of the violent storms and the countless avalanches. And then, one day, the tree yielded and fell at the command of an army of tiny beetles.

The beetles were so small that one would have to look very close to see them. They slowly bored their way through the rugged bark and into the trunk of the great tree.

This incessant attack was more than the giant of the forest could endure.

MANY PEOPLE IN this world are annoyed and tormented every day by the gnawing teeth of the beetles of tension, anxiety, worry and fear.

Psychologists say if we are unhappy it is safe to predict we spend too much time in worry. But is there anything we can do about it?

Yes, of course there is. We can learn to control a major part of the unnecessary tension and anxiety that leads to the misery of worry and fear.

Emerson once said: "We fear only that which we do not understand." Our first step in learning to control worry is to understand it.

One very wise man once said: "Worry is nothing more than holding mental pictures, in our mind, of something we do not want to happen." Surely this is true.

We think with pictures, not words. Words are only tools which we use to form pictures in our mind or in the minds of others. When we worry, we see a mental picture of something unpleasant, something we don't want to happen.

FORTUNATELY, THE mind of man can hold only one picture at a time.

The mind can alternate rapidly from one picture to another but it is impossible for us to think in two channels at one time.

So if we hold a pleasing picture in our minds we cannot see the unpleasant image at the same time. As anything else which is worthwhile, it requires some time, some effort on our part.

It requires self-discipline and practice, but we can learn to crowd the ugly pictures of worry out of our minds a good share of the time by replacing them with images which are calm, pleasant and tranquil.

That's how best to attack an army of attacking beetles.





The Grangers went to the couple's home on Ball Street in Plymouth Township with an anniversary cake and ice cream to celebrate the anniversary.





500 meals a day

They're turning out 500 meals a day in the newly revamped "scratch cooking" facilities in the J Building Senior Center in Westland.

The hot noontime meals are served Monday through Friday to senior citizens at seven centers.

The Out-Wayne County Nutrition Program could, with proper staffing, more money and additional equipment, make those figures read 2,900 meals and 48 centers.

Caroline Lewis, who five years ago helped write the program that provides elders with a combination of nutrition and sociability, is enthusiastic about the improvements that have led to 500 of the meals being cooked from scratch rather than catered.

The cost is reduced from an average of \$1.31 to 95 cents, she said, and "anytime we can lower our costs we can increase the quality of the food or the number of people served."

Receiving meals from the renovated kitchen are the lunch centers at J Building, Plymouth Tonquish Creek, Canton Recreation, Inkster Twin Towers, Huron-New Boston, Van Buren

City Hall and the Sumpter Senior Center.

Meals for other centers, like McNamara Towers in Livonia, Maplewood in Garden City, Mann in Redford Township and Cooper in Westland, could become part of the operation if expansion proceeds as Ms. Lewis would like.

"THE STATE OFFICE feels that with enough money, staffing and more equipment, this kitchen could produce food for the 2,900 meals currently served in 48 centers in Wayne County," she said.

"That is something we look forward to, because of the economy possible in preparing larger quantities of food. We will be adding more sites gradually; that is most definitely in our plans."

At a recent grand opening buffet, Ms. Lewis, head cook Yanus Howard and Dante DiVitto, director of the Wayne County Office on Aging, showed off the kitchen and its facilities for the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, the Commission on Aging and the Nutrition Program's Project Council.

Visitors viewed new ovens and refrigerators and serving trays, all part of a

renovation that used about \$100,000 in federal funds granted over several years.

In stages that covered 18 months, the building and existing equipment were brought up to code and new facilities and staff were added.

Howard now works in the big kitchen with a staff of five cooks and finds his work fulfilling and worthy of expansion.

"I like cooking and doing things for older people," he said. "This is perfect work for me."

THE NUTRITION program was mapped under a federal grant early in this decade as a means of adding to retirees well-being both nutritionally and socially.

"The aim was to provide a well-balanced meal, of course," said Ms. Lewis. "But beyond that there was the emphasis on more socializing."

"We wanted to get them back into the mainstream. So many retirees seemed to just sit home and many were not getting proper nutrition."

There are specific nutritional requirements for the meals served in the senior centers.

Nutrition with socialization has definitely been a successful concept, Ms. Lewis added. "I visit the centers regularly and talk to the retirees taking part," she said. "They seem to appreciate the meals and the chance to get out and see other people. They also like the chance for a few games of cards, and the services like craft classes, health screenings and legal aid."

"All these things are beneficial." The seniors who go to the various centers for lunch "contribute" 50 cents, said Ms. Lewis.

"It's not a payment," she added. "Those who cannot pay still eat."

While the kitchen facilities were being shown to visitors, Westland seniors were enjoying that nutrition and sociability in the dining room upstairs.

Ruth Ann and George Weber and Theresa Bauman of Wayne set down their trays with spaghetti, tossed salad, beans, pineapple upside down cake, bread and butter and beverage.

"This is really nice," Mrs. Weber said. "The meals are good and right on time, no waiting."

BESIDES HOPING to expand the

"scratch" cooking program to more centers, Ms. Lewis thinks about all the senior citizens who have never been to any of the nutrition programs.

"We know that as of the 1970 census there were some 385,000 retirees in Wayne County, about a third of all there are in Michigan," she said. "And


about a third of that number, or more than 100,000, are in the out-county areas.

"That means that the 2,900 who participate in the hot meal program represent only a small percentage of those who could."

A wanderlust cure in this self-imposed hegira

Bareboating in the Virgin Islands is not a nude encounter at sea. It's a do-it-yourself cruise for a week or two in the water of your choice in a rented boat.

The only things missing are a skipper and crew and whatever clothes that can be spared. Everything else is furnished by the rent-a-yacht people — anchors, sails, dinghy, safety equipment, snorkel gear, linens, and food and drinks.

You furnish the captain, crew and sailing expertise. If you are a sailor with hands-on knowledge of big boat handling or know one who will take you along, start packing the duffel. But think again if experience is limited to day sailing a Sunfish on Walnut Lake or

racine a Windsurfer on Cass.

Charter agents get nervous if a person can't maneuver a 30-51-foot craft (theirs) in unfamiliar waters. They'll ask if you can approach a dock under power or sail and whether you can leave the dock intact.

There will be charts to read and you should be able to pilot across reefs in the sun. Knowing how to anchor in all kinds of ground and in all kinds of sea is a handy skill, as are radio operation and first aid.

When renting a yacht, the agent will ask for documented sailing experience. Don't fake it. He will, and should, insist on hiring a captain if his suspicions are aroused by your ignorance of a self-furling jib's purpose.

When qualifications have been satisfactorily met, the next step is choosing

the destination. You choose the Virgin Islands for swimming in the aqua/lavender Caribbean during the morning, snorkeling, sunning, or shopping in the afternoon, barbecuing at sunset, and sleeping under the stars at night.

There are many boats to choose from and the soft-shouldered isles are only a morning's sail from each other. The storied trade winds blow all year at a steady pace and the temperature hovers at 75 or 80 degrees. And, the cruising ground is protected from the heavy swells coming down the Atlantic from the north.

WHEN TO GO? Any chance which surfaces, some say. For novices, the best bet may be spring and summer when winds are gentle, 10-18 knots, and harbors less crowded. The price is

right, too. You save \$220 to \$350 per week off season, which runs April through November.

Three years ago, on my first voyage, I sailed with husband Chuck, and friends, Ed and Eleanor Mooney of West Bloomfield.

We fought the winds, sometimes gusting to 35 knots, and chop every morning for four days, until we anchored, happy to be warm and dry in some protected cove. Now we all carry foul weather gear, remembering that first experience.

Twenty charter agents operate out of the Virgin Islands, making it the largest industry there. The following three companies, in our experience, provide safe, well-maintained boats and provide reassuring services for the first time charterer:

• **CARIBBEAN YACHT** Charter, Inc., a long taxi ride from Charlotte Amalie, St. Thomas, is small enough for personal attention and big enough to have a fleet of 19 Morgan Out Islanders. The taxi ride shows the backside of the island, which you miss staying in town, shopping and dining at tourist spots.

We rented a 36-foot Morgan, Kona Kai, with split cabin and two heads. Kona Kai means big wind, which for us was a small prophecy. Each couple had a roomy cabin, but the arrangement sleeps six comfortably.

The center cabin galley accommodates the early morning rush when some want to sleep and some want hot coffee. There is plenty of seating room in the cockpit and a bimini top is furnished.

Like all boats rented by major agents, these boats have plenty of tank space for fuel, for drinking and showering water. Icebox space is adequate and ice is available on all large islands.

• **CARIBBEAN SAILING** Yachts, Ltd., is the biggest charter agent in the area. Its fleet of 60, 33-44-footers, especially designed and built by CSY, is Tortola-based.

Beginning a cruise in the center of the island chain at Tortola, instead of off St. Thomas at the far eastern end, is a time-saver for a seven-day cruise. Whether you pick up your boat on St. Thomas or Tortola, there are direct routes to St. Thomas from Detroit on most major airlines.

You can stay in Charlotte Amalie for a day or two and you can taxi out to the boat on the assigned day. Or you can fly out of Charlotte Amalie in a pontoon boat on arrival day.

Board the sea-plane downtown on the waterfront in Charlotte Amalie. The charter agent picks you up in Roadtown, Tortola, for the ride to your boat, which sails out the same day.

THE MOORINGS, Ltd., provides a complete resort service on Tortola for their customers. You fly into Roadtown

early and swim in their pool, play tennis, dine in the dockside restaurant and watch as your boat is checked out and provisioned.

The Moorings has Morgans and Gulfstar 37s and 50s, all rigged for easy cock-pit handling. Some cruising groups return to the Mooring's eight-acre complex mid-cruise to have a hot shower, a game of tennis and to get their land legs before starting out again.

BAREBOATING DOESN'T mean bare cupboards. For a fee, agents fill your larder and stock whatever drinks you order. CYC provides a looseleaf notebook with all menus written out and food stored in order of use.

Provisions are plentiful. The Moorings once gave us so much food we gave it away to a man who had run away from home and job and was sailing the Caribbean single-handedly.

Charters include full or split provisioning plans. You may prefer to buy your own food, but cruise once or twice to get to know the territory beforehand. Some experienced bareboaters bring food from home.

The tab for full provisioning (three

meals) per person, per day is from \$9.75 to \$12; \$7.75 to \$10 per person per day will give you breakfast, lunch and snacks.


Dinner is on your own. You may choose the Peter Island Yacht Club, where \$100 will get you dinner for four and no wine. Jackets and a ties are required.

Or choose Foxy's on Jost Van Dyke where you dinghy into shore in your cut-offs and where there are no doors to post "you must wear a shirt and shoes" signs.

Dinner is served outdoors on wooden tables and dancing is done on sandy floors. The cook is an independent soul who will cook your dinner to order, if the right fish can be caught that day and if there are enough people to make it worth her while.

Bareboating is an encounter at sea and it can be anything you make it. First, you must have seven days, or two or three weeks to spare. Then charter a boat.

If you've been messing about in boats for a long time and still feel unsure — go ahead and hire a skipper. Or be your own. Anyway you do it, do it. The Virgin Islands are too good to miss

TRAVEL LOG of Iris Jones

How many times have you watched that scene on the screen? The heroine decides, for whatever reason, to catch the first plane out. She walks into an apartment, transfers clothes haphazardly from drawers to suitcase, snaps the suitcase shut with a dramatic click and walks out.

When you and I try that, we get a handful of unwashed underwear and forget to pack our shoes.

Hollywood-style packing may not be as easy as it looks, but skilled travelers can pack a suitcase in a hurry if they know the rules.

• Know what clothes travel well. Buy them for home and vacation wear.

• Pack in your notebook beforehand.

• Have everything cleaned and mended before the suitcase comes out from under the bed.

• Think small. Think comfortable.

When friends ask, "Why are you spending all that money for a week in Mexico City?" You reply: "I'm buying these clothes for when I get home." Clothes that travel well by land and sea, go equally well from suburb to city, office to cocktail party, to home.

Men usually buy clothes for active living. They pick a single color scheme, and choose a suit as well as a jacket-and-slacks set that fits it. Shirts and ties coordinate with both outfits. Socks are black; the overcoat matches everything. That is why a man can wear a suit, pack an extra outfit, throw the miscellaneous into the suitcase pocket and go.

Women, too, can do it if they pack a single color

scheme. Shoes, handbag and other accessories will go with everything toned to one color. Pack a dress and matching jacket, add slacks or a skirt to wear with the same jacket, a long skirt or an uncrushable long dress and go.




