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Police want 2-mill tax hike for operations

Canton Police Chief Jerry Cox says special assessment funding of his department will have to be increased from two to four mills in order to "handle the workload."

Cox also maintains that it will take at least three mills just to maintain the status quo. In fact, the police department operated on two mills this year, with nearly an additional mill of revenues coming out of Canton Township's general fund.

Canton can raise the police millage without holding an election under laws governing special assessment millage.

Although officials say public hearings would be held prior to any action, approval of the Canton board is the sole requirement.

The special assessment millage to establish a full-time police department was approved by voters last year. The original budget for the department was \$428,000. If the police department gets four mills, its budget will be close to \$1 million.

Cox's explanation of why his department needs more money came at a seminar devoted to assorted issues of concern to Canton residents.

The meeting was called last week by Supervisor Noel Culbert to get public reaction to subjects that are expected to come before the township board in the future.

Many of the residents who attended the meeting indicated that they did not object to increased police millage if the additional costs could be justified.

ACCORDING to Cox, the Canton police department, even after recent additions to the staff, has a much lower ratio of officers per population than other communities.

Communities in the surrounding area have an average of 2.7 officers per 1,000 residents. Canton's average is .55 officers per 1,000 residents, Cox said.

The police chief said one of the additional mills would cover the money now coming from the general fund and merely keep the department at its present staffing level. To keep up with the township's growth, he wants six more officers and the establishment of a cadet program. The two additions would cost about one mill.

Based on Canton's SEV (State Equalized Valuation), one mill for special assessment purposes will generate about \$318,000 in 1979.

According to Culbert, that sum is not Canton's actual SEV. "The actual SEV is more like \$340,000, but, by law, we cannot levy on personal property for special assessments."

Cox said he realized residents did not want increased taxes.

"But the last thing I want to happen is, because I didn't have the guts to stand up and ask for more money, someone died waiting for a police car," Cox said.

"It's gotten to the point where we have got to have an increase. Our ability to handle the workload is not what it should be."

Cable TV service is on its way to Canton

Within a year, cable television should be available to at least some Canton residents for an installation charge of

\$25 and a minimum fee of \$5.95 a month.

Within 18 months, the system should

be available to half the residents who live within Canton's serviceable area — defined as regions with at least 70 homes per square mile.

Jeff Dorn, vice president of Omnicon of Michigan, outlined that timetable for establishing a cable TV system after the township board last week approved his firm's application for a non-exclusive franchise.

He said Omnicon will start building

the system within six months of obtaining franchises from Canton, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township.

Last week, the Plymouth City Commission granted a franchise to Omnicon. Dorn said his firm is committed to building the system for Plymouth and Canton regardless of decisions made by neighboring communities to join.

THE SYSTEM will offer up to 35 television channels to subscribers, including special movie channels, a sports channel, a children's program channel, a time-weather channel and a channel that will air local governmental meetings.

Programs from Chicago, Atlanta, New York, Boston and San Francisco will be aired via satellite.

Dorn said his firm made several con-

cessions to Canton Township in order to receive franchise approval.

The demands were made by the township's cable TV study committee, composed of Treasurer Jim Donahue, planning commissioner Thom Carman, Trustee Stephen Larson and Trustee Robert Greenstein.

One concession requires Omnicon to

Short Takes

Meeting of minds

The Plymouth Canton School board holds its regularly scheduled meeting beginning 8 p.m. today, July 23, in the administration building on Harvey in Plymouth. Included on the agenda is the administration recommendation to contract a construction management firm and an architect for phase one of a proposed bond issue.

The Canton Township Board of Trustees holds its regularly scheduled meeting beginning 7 p.m. Tuesday at the administration building on Canton Center Road. A discussion of an interim zoning ordinance, tabled from last week, is on the agenda.

A class act

Canton residents may find their homeowner's insurance bill is a little less in the future. Canton Fire Chief Mel Paulin says the township was changed from an 8 rating to a 6 rating by the Insurance Services Office of Michigan. The new rating has to do with the relative safety of a community and is taken into account by insurance companies. Paulin says the fire department asked for a reinspection a few years back and finally got the results. Inspections will continue periodically during the next 10 years, during which any new addition in fire equipment or staff could further reduce the rating.

MD concerts

Two concerts to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Foundation are planned for next month. The first fund-raiser, called a Jamboree by coordinator Gary Roberts, will be held from 6 p.m. to 2 a.m., Aug. 15 at Center Stage. Some 15 bands are scheduled to play, with admission set at \$3. The second concert is set for noon until 2 a.m. at the UAW hall, with most of the same bands featured. Once again, the admission is \$3, with children under 5 admitted free. Roberts said he and Jim Bridenthol of Bridenthol Construction are sponsoring the fund-raisers.

Water, water everywhere

The Canton Township Board of Trustees Thursday night approved the spending of some \$1.5 million from the water fund to pay for installation of several water mains, regulators and a meter pit. According to Supervisor Noel Culbert, the new installations should "provide more water pressure." New mains include a 16-inch main on Morton Taylor from Ford Road to north of Franklin Palmer Estates; a 12-inch main from the subdivision to Palmer; a 12-inch main on Palmer between Brookhaven and Sheldon.

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Pollution levels low out-county; standards met

How's the air in western Wayne County?

"Generally pretty good," says Howard Murray, of the Wayne County Air Pollution Control Division. "You're in a better, much better condition of air quality than the downriver area, obviously."

The air in the western suburbs is "meeting all of the federal air quality standards," said Murray, the pollution control division's public information officer.

Pollution control, part of the county health department, measures air quality daily through 14 automatic monitoring stations, Murray explained. There are also 22 county air pollution inspectors.

THERE'S A station near Schoolcraft and Levan in Livonia and one along Cherry Hill Road in Westland. Seven of the stations are in Detroit.

Pollution control's downtown office gets readings from the various unmanned stations "every 15 minutes," Murray said. The monitoring network is tested twice every day at 8 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The stations keep track of "suspended particles" (dust and dirt), carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen dioxide and ozone, Murray said. Their origins are automobile emissions, industrial and utility power plants.

The best example Murray could give of the western suburbs' good air quality was consistently low readings of dust and dirt. The federal quality standard for dust and dirt particles is 75 micrograms per cubic meter of air. Murray said readings for the out-county suburbs are "at or below 60 micrograms."

AIR POLLUTION is related to the concentration of people, vehicles and industry. "The denser these concentrations become, the greater the problem," Murray said.

Thus, western Wayne, with a mix of auto plants, lighter industry and scores of subdivisions, fares better than the industry-glutted downriver area and downtown Detroit.

Murray said he didn't think the 1½-year-old Jeffries freeway through the western suburbs has adversely affected the air.

The air pollution reports heard on radio and television come from Murray's office and are based on one reading downtown and whatever station is reporting the highest pollutant.

Air pollution is measured on a scale of 0-300, Murray said, with "100 or below the benchmark for air quality."

The county's been monitoring the air, based on federal standards, since the early 1970s.

receive township board approval for cable TV rate structures.

According to Dorn, the rates have already been established. Fees are \$5.95 a month for the economy package with 12 channels and \$7.95 a month for the basic package that includes all services except a movie option.

The economy movie package will run an additional \$5.95 a month and will feature four to five new movies rated "G" or "PG." The movies will be repeated several times. The full movie package, priced at \$7.95 a month, will feature 18 to 20 new movies rated at "G," "PG" or "R."

Subscribers who want more than one cable TV outlet will be charged additional fees of a few dollars a month.

OTHER CONCESSIONS made by Omnicom include an agreement to establish a citizens committee that will review the type of programming that is aired on the cable system.

The committee will be formed with representatives of township government, the school systems, sports organizations and other groups once 35 percent of eligible Canton residents sign subscriptions.

A business office will be located in Canton to enable residents to file complaints or make suggestions about the cable system.

Omnicom's original proposal called for local origination channels that would air governmental meetings from the Canton, Plymouth and Northville communities.

But Dorn said that his firm has agreed to Canton's demand for "discreet" local channels. Under the agreement between Omnicom and the township, three channels will be made available for the airing of Canton governmental meetings. The programs will not be broadcast beyond Canton's borders without the express consent of the township board.

A studio will also be established for the production of local programs.

"One of the biggest things is that we want to involve the schools and have students put on productions," Dorn said.

THE ORDINANCE that grants Omnicom the cable television franchise for a 15-year period requires the firm to pay Canton three percent of local gross subscriber revenues.

Township Supervisor Noel Culbert

estimates that Canton could receive \$18,000 a year from the agreement.

"I think it's great," Culbert said of the proposed cable TV service. "I think a lot of people will want to use it."

The ordinance requires Omnicom to post a \$10,000 performance bond ensuring that all terms of the agreement are met. Other cable TV companies could be granted franchises under the document.

Dorn estimated the cost of building the cable TV system at \$4 million.

SEMTA fares to go up

Bus and rail customers of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) will pay more to ride it beginning Sept. 1.

The SEMTA board of directors this week unanimously approved a five cent increase in base fares to 55 cents. Travel zone charges will remain the same at 15 cents.

The base fare covers travel through two zones.

The base fare hike is the first in eight years.

The fares for passengers aged 18 and under will also increase a nickel to 35 cents.

A SEMTA spokeswoman said the increased fares will raise \$500,000 more operating revenue and allow the trans-

portation authority to "maintain its current ratios of revenue to cost."

The new fares will put a one-way commuter rail trip from Birmingham to Detroit at \$1.15. The trip on bus will be \$1.

The board decided to maintain the 25 percent discount on SEMTA cards and the 10 percent discount on 10 exact fare tickets.

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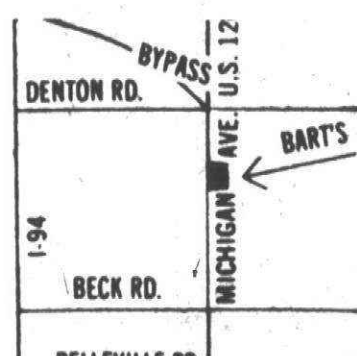
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Music fills summer evenings in the park

After intermission, a Dixieland group, members of the band, played "South" and "Dardenella."

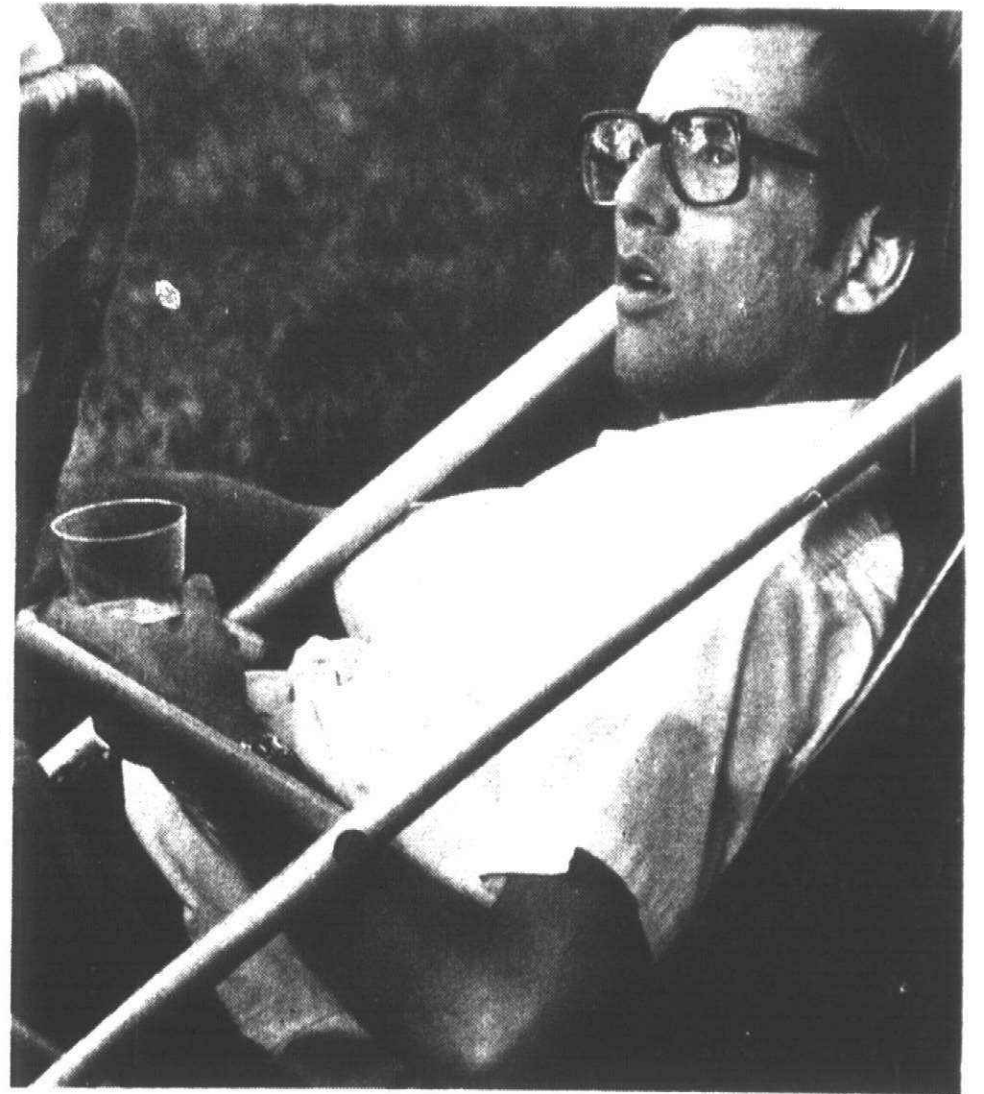
The full band returned to stage for "12th Street Rag," "Lullaby of Birdland" and "An Ellington Portrait."

Cute trick wearing thin

Almost everybody had to chuckle when insurance salesman Barry Bremen slipped undetected into the pre-game warm-up drill of the National Basketball Association all-star game in the Silverdome last February.

The attention was understandable. With one easy layup, the Southfield businessman fulfilled a pipe dream of many backyard basketball players. Frustrated jocks from coast to coast got a vicarious thrill from those few short moments Bremen was able to pass himself off as a pro in practice.

The imposter joke was still funny when we found the latter-day Walter Mitty playing golf in the U.S. Open last month in Toledo.

We cheered when we heard he parred the first two holes before falling to pieces with a triple bogey.

But I wasn't overjoyed upon hearing that the great imposter had surfaced again in Seattle last week during the 50th Major League Baseball All-Star Game.

His appearance was no surprise to this newsroom. The week before we got a call at the paper from the Seattle Mariners press office asking if we'd sent a guy named Barry Bremen out west to cover the contest for the "Southfield Observer." Nice try, wrong name, Barry. But he managed to fool somebody with phony "International News Service (INS)" credentials.

Enough's enough, Bremen. I don't want to have to do another feature story a year from now on the local imposter who crashes the curling matches in Saskatoon. I mean this guy is running out of professional sports stars to impersonate.

After hearing from Bremen on the phone and wishing him good luck in crashing the game, I groaned when I heard he was successful again. I knew full well I'd have to write another account of Bremen's "Walter Mitty-like" impersonation of a major league all-star.

It's "a natural feature story," but why encourage such antics in print? However, I must be in the minority. The Bremen saga is largely a media-engineered event. And media attention shows no signs of abating. Channel 7 sports editor Al Ackerman carried the latest imposter stunt as the lead item on last Tuesday night's sports report.

NBC sportscaster and author Dick Schaap never fails to air Bremen's escapades on television shows such as the Today Show, the Tonight Show and NBC Sportsworld. In fact, it was the TV production crews who helped Bremen gain access to the field and wired him for sound once he got there by putting microphones in his specially-made uniform.

Last Thursday I got a call from a chap named Leon Freilich, reporter for a tabloid called "The Star," sold in supermarkets throughout this country of ours. Freilich wanted to know if the Southfield Eccentric knew of "this true eccentric" Barry Bremen.

Like most reporters on the staff of sensationalistic publications, Mr. Freilich was veddy English. He also knew nothing about baseball, wondering who the Yankees were playing in this all-star game. I gave him Bremen's work number, figuring that anybody who seeks publicity as much as Bremen wouldn't mind being hounded by the tabloid tattlers.

Only local sportscaster Dave Diles gave Bremen a shot for overdoing it. Bremen didn't dig the dig.

"IT'S FUN for the players too," Bremen says in defense of his imposter antics. "I wouldn't do it when a guy's about to make a crucial putt or try it in the final game of the World Series. This was just a game and I didn't interfere with the play. So it doesn't matter to me what some of the news guys like Dave Diles say. I got 99 percent good

vibrations from the thing. There are always people who'll say something or are always sarcastic about everything."

Talk is cheap but Bremen's stunts aren't. In the latest adventure, he had a Yankee uniform specially tailored to fit him, flew to Seattle and helped pay a freelance camera crew to record his stunt.

The \$50 fine slapped on Bremen by the Seattle judge for criminal trespassing must have been small change to this West Bloomfield sports zealot. Bremen said he wouldn't have even have showed up for the arraignment if he didn't want his uniform back, which police had confiscated.

One of the reasons he wanted the uniform back is that it was worn during the game by New York Yankee right-fielder and candy bar namesake Reggie Jackson. Jackson forgot to bring his uniform with him for the all-star game and Bremen's uniform was pressed into service after Bremen was arrested on the dugout steps.

It was all worth it, to hear Bremen. "The players were all absolutely fantastic toward me," he said. "I'm with the all stars of the game and here they are excited about seeing me, the imposter. I was of interest to them. They put me in a sauna to hide me from the Secret Service when Gerald Ford visited the American League squad. Every 15 minutes they'd come back to check on me. There was like a camaraderie with me and the players."

I know how it must feel to hobnob with the sports elite. I met Detroit Tiger third baseman Aurelio Rodriguez a couple weeks ago when I went to the game with his optometrist. I'll never forget the words he left us with.

"Hey, Doc, don't forget my wife's sunglasses. Remember, Saturday, the sunglasses. Hokay, Doc?"

Being that close to greatness leaves one understandably in awe.

What's for taxpayers?

Plymouth Township has a nice problem a lot of municipalities would like to share.

It has a surplus of about \$300,000 — give or take \$20,000. And the board cannot agree on what to do with the money.

Earlier there were a lot of ideas about budgeting the surplus for capitol improvements, such as the new township hall facilities in the Teledyne Building, improvements at the recreation site or at the golf course.

Those ideas were merely tossed about for awhile because the board wasn't sure of the exact amount of the surplus. Now that it knows, another option has cropped up to make the decision more difficult.

And that option is to spend the money on an operating expense during the coming budget year only — mainly, to pay for the expanded police services to be provided by the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

THE MAJORITY of the board, at its last meeting, decided to re-allocate the current surplus into the upcoming fiscal year operating budget to pay the bill for expanded police protection.

To the majority, that must have seemed like a wise thing to do from a political standpoint because it avoided the need — for this year at least — to ask voters to approve millage to pay the bill.

While negotiations with the sheriff were going on, the assumption had been to seek voter approval for added millage in a special Sept. 11 election.

Instead, the majority of trustees voted to cancel the plans to ask voters for millage approval and instead spend the \$300,000 surplus for police protection.

More recently, however, the supervisor discovered that this strategy may not work. While working on the upcoming township budget, he discovered a shortfall in operating funds which will

have to be made up somehow. Reportedly, he plans to ask the board to go ahead with its earlier plans to seek voter approval for the police millage.

If voters approve the police millage, the supervisor reasons, then the upcoming budget can balance and whatever is left of the surplus can be spent on capitol improvements — such as the township hall, recreation site, or golf course.

The original issue, then, will return to the full board to be aired again.

IN CONSIDERING the issue, a lot of weight should be given to what is fair for taxpayers. After all, it's their money and their best interests should be paramount.

If the \$300,000 was paid into township coffers by taxpayers in one year, then it would be fair and just to let the money pour out of the coffers during the coming year. That way all those who paid would have a reasonable chance of receiving a benefit.

After all, that's the basic justification behind any government's authority to tax its residents — that a benefit will be received from the taxes paid. If no benefit is received, then the justification to tax is questionable.

The problem with the \$300,000 surplus is that it was generated over a period of years — three, four, five years or more. Thus some of the taxes which generated the surplus were paid by taxpayers living in the township three, four, five or more years ago.

Given the rate of turnover in suburban areas, a number of township residents who lived here and paid taxes four, five years ago are no longer here. Is it right, then, to use some of their tax contributions to provide a "windfall" in one year to current taxpayers? It may be politically wise, but is it right?

Let's also look forward a bit. Is it right to give the windfall to current taxpayers, and avoid the need to pay police millage in 1979-80, and tax fu-

ture taxpayers for police protection. After all, it's certain future taxpayers will be paying for police protection.

Is it not fairer to use the \$300,000 collected from past and present taxpayers to pay for facilities which will benefit present and future taxpayers? If the money is spent on the park, for instance, all present and future taxpayers will receive a benefit.

But money spent on police protection will be consumed in one year in such things as salaries, benefits, gasoline, etc., and will not be available for use the following year. That is the basic difference between operating and capitol expenses — are they consumed in one year alone or will the consumption extend over a period of years?

Those expenditures which buy benefits which can be consumed over a period of years are called capital expenditures, or capital improvements. It's that simple — there's really no mystery about capital budgeting and the justification for capital spending.

I don't now much about the supervisor's latest run through the budget and the conclusions he reached. I don't know the know the specific details about how the surplus was generated (although how it came to be isn't that relevant to how it should be spent).

But I am convinced that surplus funds, when they reach a point where they exceed the amount needed to cover contingencies, ought to be spent for capitol improvements. I think equity demands it.

The Plymouth City Commission overlooked equity when it adopted its last budget by ploughing back generated surplus funds into the upcoming operating budget to lower the amount of tax hike needed to balance. It was politically wise, but not fiscally sound.

Current residents do, of course, lend support to such political decisions because most are willing to absorb benefits today without concern about future generations or equity.

Gas shortage is a fake — but gas hogs are real

If there isn't a 40-year-old movie with a scene like this, there should be.

A young man and woman are sitting in the club car of a moving train, sipping wine and laughing as wheat fields pass by the window. They both wear hats. A newspaper dated 1939 lies on the tablecloth next to a cut-crystal bud vase.

"You haf identity papers, yes? Traffel papers, no?" a Teutonic

voice screams suddenly. It is the Inspector. He looks like Peter Lorre in a black uniform.

"In my country, you just get up and go when you want to," replies the indignant young man, as he takes the woman's arm and rises to his feet. He looks like Jimmy Stewart.

"Not so fast, pliz. We haf different customs," replies the Inspector. Camera climbs above the brass

glittering on his peaked uniform cap to focus on the wheat fields whizzing by. There are grunts and the sounds of rubber hoses at work.

"Especially on odd numbered days," screams the inspector.

GAS RATIONING is lurking out there, and pretty soon you may not need Peter Lorre checking travel papers to make sure you stay at home.

Last week, a sort of traveling black plague swept five Michigan cities. It was a fact-finding group out to test the waters of public opinion on two varying methods of gas rationing. The odd-even system already in use in several states was one of them. The other would set a minimum purchase requirement to eliminate the practice of needlessly topping off gasoline tanks.

Personally, I find neither of these methods repugnant. They might even be good for the economy — odd-even rationing would be a boon to somebody smart enough to market easy-off, Velcro license plate tabs. The \$10 minimum purchase would spur plenty of people to install 25-gallon gas tanks in Toyotas. This would allow them to drive from state to state until they found a pump without a line.

Something has to be done about gas lines and fossil fuel panics, and since I don't think my personal plan stands much chance of running the gauntlet of oil lobbyists, maybe rationing is a realistic answer. I still like my idea, though — every time a gas station runs out of gas, we all get together and hoist the chairman of the board of Exxon into the air,

Something screwy is going on when, as was the case earlier this year, oil imports are up while gasoline supplies are down and oil company PR flaks mumble something about Iran. I also don't understand the logic of restricting oil imports — if oil really is in short supply, whose oil do you want to use up first? Ours, or theirs?

This whole situation is giving the phrase "Burn, baby, burn," an updated, contemporary meaning.

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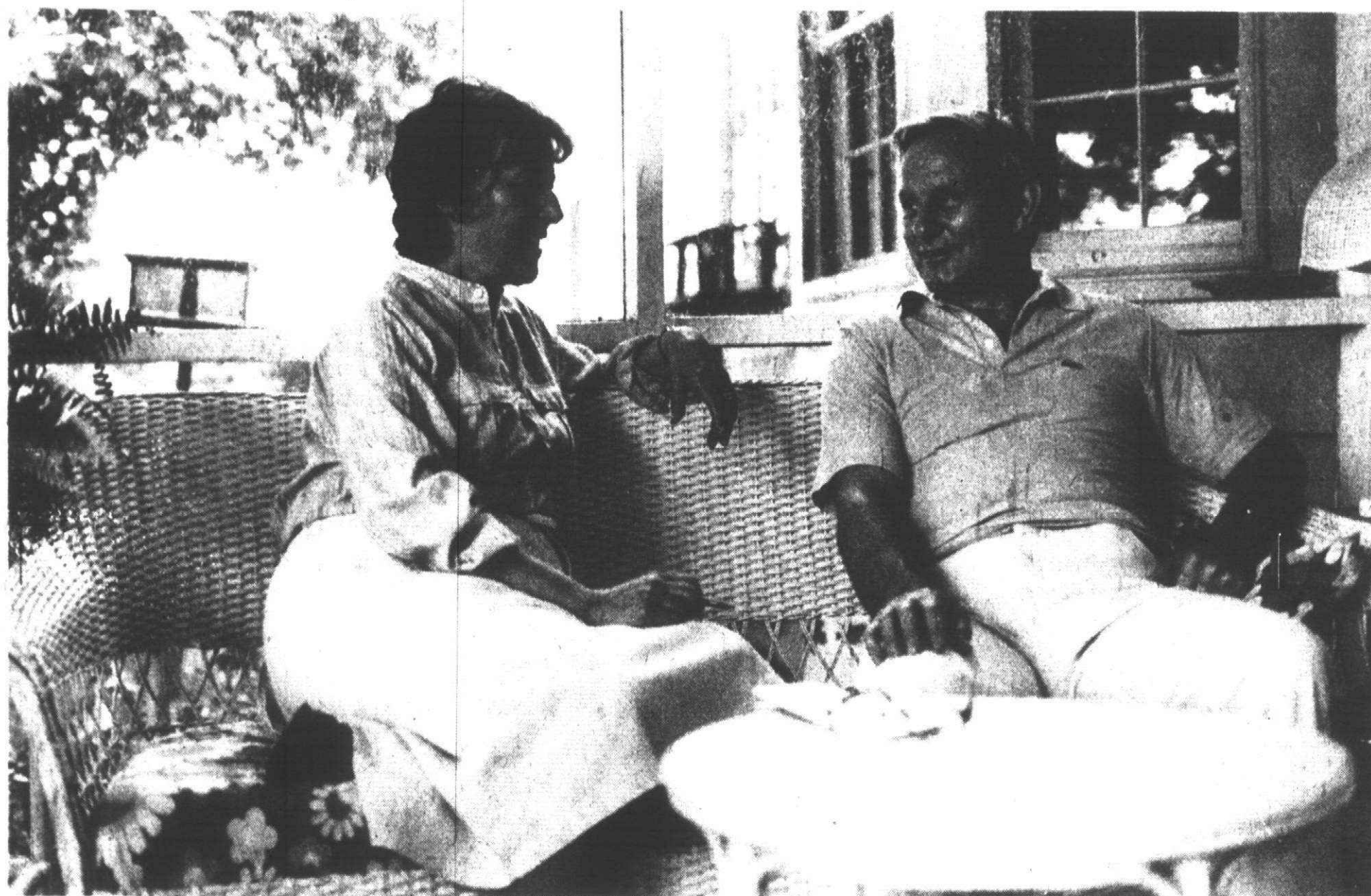

Like most parents in that situation, they felt the tender pangs of watching a child grow up and go away.

For the Bowes that experience hasn't passed, although it may have mellowed.

Now, almost a decade since their daughter Ann enrolled in college, the Bowes have four college bound children — at the same time.

Ann, 25, is a third year law student at Marquette University in Wisconsin.

Gail, 21, is a recent recreation graduate from Northern Michigan University with plans for graduate study.

Jane, 18, will be a freshman at Western Michigan University in the fall. She is considering the studying dietetics.

Peter, 23, has re-enrolled at Wayne State University. He'll be a junior in fine arts in the fall.

Plymouth bats come alive

The Plymouth Elks won a must game Thursday evening and sent the Redford Adray Connie Mack Baseball League into a quandary.

Plymouth used the mercy rule to beat Canton Little Caesars in five innings, 11-0.

Going into weekend action, Caesars leads the league with a 13-5-1 mark. Plymouth is 10-5. On position day Saturday, Plymouth was to have played Southfield in a double header while Canton tangled with Farmington.

The Elks have games to make up and was declared the third place team for position day behind Farmington based on total points.

Thursday's game was the last meeting between Canton and Plymouth. The Elks won the series, 3-2.

"I wish we could have played the Elks because I believe we're the two best teams in the league," said Canton coach John Gravin.

A win would have put Canton in the driver's seat but the Elks seem to be alive and kicking after the surprisingly easy victory.

"We were more in the game tonight," said Elks coach Brian Gilles. "We're mentally into some games more than others."

TWO CANTON infield errors to start the game led to two unearned runs.

Paul Woodard and Paul Dillon reached base on the consecutive errors. Sam Merrill, Plymouth's leftfielder, drove home the first run and first base-

man Jim Anderson slapped home the second off Canton starter Brian James.

"We gave them opportunities right off the bat," Gravin said. "We just didn't come ready to play."

In the second inning, Plymouth collected three more runs off James to take a 5-0 lead.

Chris Hannan reached base on a bunt single and Dillon walked. Merrill then greeted James with a line-shot homer over the dead-center field fence at Canton.

Plymouth made it 6-0 in the third inning when Matt Etienne, who had walked, scooted home on a wild pitch.

James left the game in third inning and was replaced by Pat McNamara who held Plymouth scoreless in the fourth inning but was plagued by the error bugaboo in the fifth.

With the help of two infield errors and five singles, Plymouth tallied five runs to take a commanding 11-0 lead.

Uniformity needed for Adray baseball

What is the state of the Livonia Adray Baseball League?

The opinion in this area seems to differ.

The league is down to five teams — Griffin Sports Shop, Livonia Adray, Westland, Redford and Wendy's of Livonia.

On one occasion, Redford had trouble fielding enough players. It has occurred more than once with the Westland team.

The league has produced some good teams over the years but never a champion at the prestigious All-American Baseball Association (AABA) tournament in Johnston, Pa.

The Detroit Adray League has produced numerous champions, mainly because of its unlimited boundaries. The Detroit teams can recruit players anywhere in the country. A pitcher from the Big Eight League is not uncommon.

The Livonia Adray League requires residency. Last year it allowed four non-resident players. This season it allows seven. Teams such as Griffin and Livonia Adray must have at least eight residents from Livonia on their respective teams.

Garden City once had a team but forfeited itself out last season. A team from Farmington participated many years ago and Redford Adray, currently in fourth place, dominated the league for many years when coached by Bob Atkins, now Redford Union athletic director.

A team from the Plymouth-Canton community may come a reality next year. It's a growing community with a number of qualified players.

"WE INCREASED the number of outsiders on each roster this year to improve ourselves in the national tourney," said Stu Rose, Livonia Parks and Recreation athletic supervisor.

"It takes a strong manager who is willing to go out and recruit. We've tried to get teams from Garden City and Plymouth but it didn't work out this year."

"We want to have six strong teams. Birmingham Lynch has inquired about joining the league next year and maybe a team will come out of Plymouth."

"I'm pretty confident all five teams will be back."

Roger Frayer, now athletic director at Livonia Stevenson and coach of second place Griffin, is disillusioned with the league.

"This could be my last year," he said. "I didn't like the entire philosophy change."

"I've been to Johnston and I think we're at a disadvantage. I have a good sponsor and our uni-

forms and equipment are second to none.

"But I'm not in favor of more outsiders and I don't think Livonia can support three quality teams. The talent is diluted somewhat."

"I don't enjoy calling kids and get involved in a recruiting skirmish. I don't like calling a kid in February and telling him he can play first base."

Frayer said the sponsors and coaches were never consulted about increasing the number of outsiders from four to seven. He said it doesn't make that much difference when you are playing at Johnston.

"This year is not as strong," Frayer said. "This is the least emotional ball club I've had."

Ron Hellier, who coached Griffin before Frayer and who is the coach of Livonia Adray, said "things will look better in the future."

"I like the seven outsiders instead of four," said Hellier, an athletic director at Belleville and former Livonia Franklin coach.

"I know of two pretty good teams who inquired about playing this year. It was just the case of entering a little too late."

"This year it's been all right because more kids (in Livonia) got to play. I guess the talent on some teams is not what it was but I think it's better for the national tournament."

"I don't mind going out and recruiting players. There are enough athletes out there."

Hellier said the league "doesn't look better overall but next year it should be stronger."

"To start a team you need a good sponsor and a growing community. Garden City is losing kids but Plymouth will continue to grow."

Atkins, who coached varsity football and baseball at Redford Union, now directs the defending national champions out of the Detroit Adray League — Adray Appliance.

"I HAD SOME TREMENDOUS teams while coaching Redford," said Atkins. "I had some excellent young men and while I was coaching, Redford Union and Thurston were at the top at the time."

"I really enjoy the competitiveness of the Detroit Adray League. I still have the little boy in me. A sponsor is a big thing. We play 40 games including exhibitions."

"I like the Detroit League because it is a challenge. It's produced eight national champs in the last 15 years. There is no finer tournament around."

"I think a strong league begins with good administration," said (Continued on page 3B)

The problem with the Livonia league and its lack of interest this season may not be with the administration.

George Yakel, coach for 10 years in Westland, pulled out this season because he didn't have enough players. Several good Westland players opted for the Detroit Adray League.

A concentrated effort must be made by the Livonia Parks and Recreation Department to not lose players out of places like Redford, Garden City and Westland.

I'd like to see the AABA have the same rules for all the teams who play at Johnstown, whether it be unlimited boundaries or some type of residency requirement.

A team that draws players from all over the nation has a distinct advantage come tourney time.

The whole process in the Detroit and Livonia leagues should be scrutinized carefully.

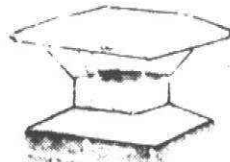

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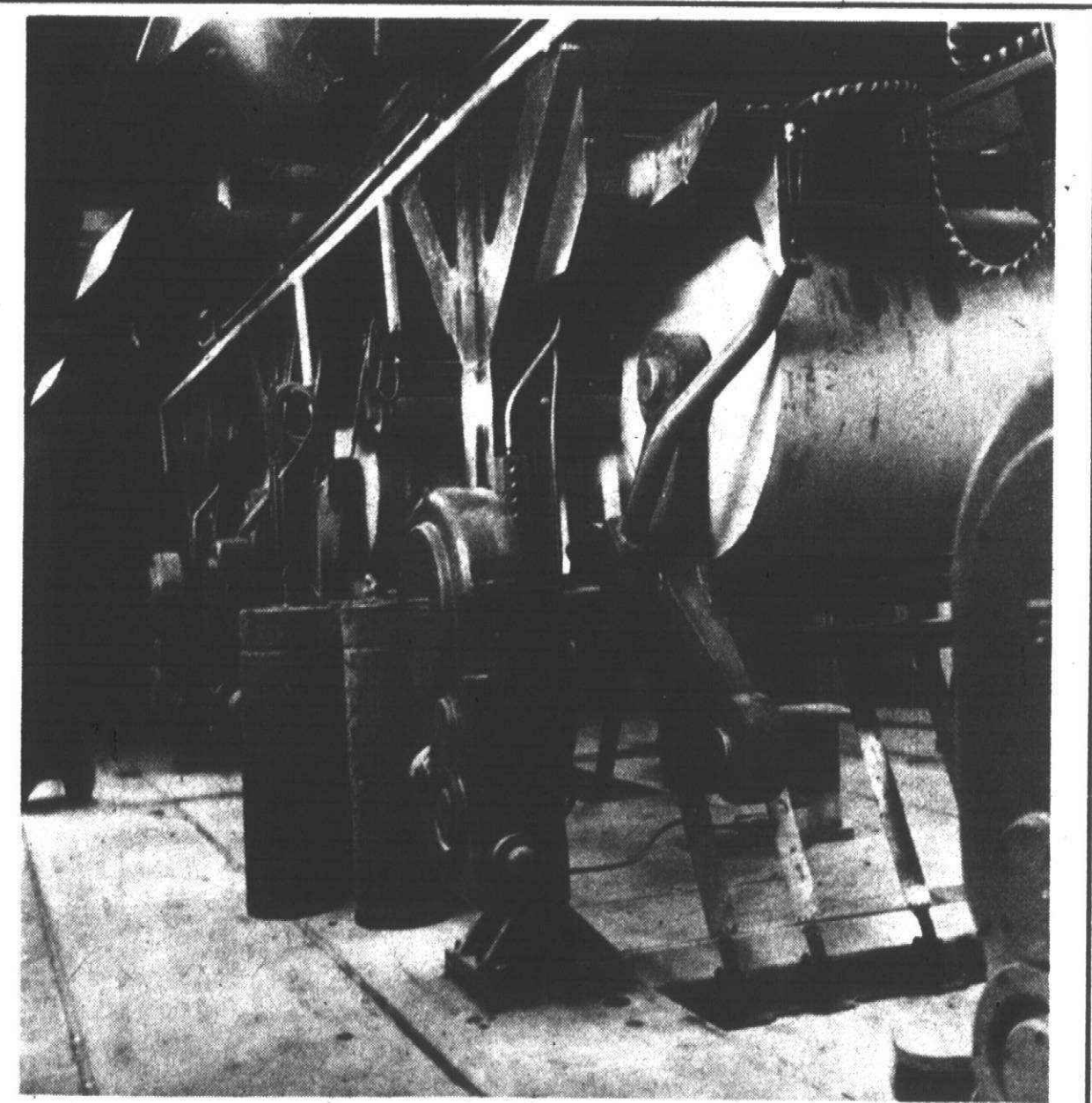

Latest Eastwood movie portrays drab prison life

Since movies about prison life always seem to be around ("The Longest Yard," "Short Eyes," "On the Yard," etc.), there must be an audience for them — people who find these movies enormously entertaining. I am not one of them.

Prison films, as a category, are low on my list of preferences. Even so, I find "Escape from Alcatraz" (PG) a film I can admire if not entirely enjoy.

It is expertly crafted. Everything fits together as precisely, as the parts of a Jaguar engine. Don Siegel's taut direction is a marvel of economy that welds the stark location (Alcatraz), low-key lighting, prudent photography and terse dialogue into a lean effective melodrama. The impact results from this singular matchup of form (the elements of production) and content (the story).

BASED ON A true event, the film features Clint Eastwood as Frank Morris who, with two accomplices, became the only prisoners ever to escape from Alcatraz, the former maximum security Federal penitentiary.

Siegel and Eastwood have worked together five times, and the director is credited with those films recognized as Eastwood's best, including "Coogan's Bluff" and "Dirty Harry." The current film is no exception to their successful record and is a decided improvement over Eastwood's last effort ("Every Which Way But Loose") in which he was outacted by an orangutan.

In "Escape from Alcatraz," Siegel uses the Eastwood mannerisms to maximum advantage. The steely stare, the squint, the calculated moves, the existential loneliness — all work toward reinforcing the sense of strength and inner resolve of the character.

The dialogue is sparingly but precisely parcelled out. Like the photography, it only reveals what is necessary to move things along, without being either skimpy or superfluous.

FROM MORRIS' first encounter with the tough, egotistical warden (Patrick McGeehan), who takes a peacock pride in running an escape-proof prison, the film inexorably proceeds through the stages of formulation, planning, preparation and escape. The climax and denouement actually constitute the weakest part of the film, but fortunately they only account for the last 10 minutes.

During this progression, Siegel touches on every convention of the prison film: The spoon stolen from the cafeteria, the homosexual bully, the dehumanization, the "old" prisoner with a hobby, the prisoner with a pet, the racial tension.

It is all quite familiar, but neither boring nor grim. The capable cast, crisp direction and finely honed script make a high-class entertainment package.

"Escape from Alcatraz" wasn't intended as meaningful social drama. Nevertheless, it effectively conveys the drabness and monotony of prison life and the effort it takes to remain human.

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

Sculptor lines up her troops

When the new west side section of Telegraph, south of 13 Mile opens, drivers will be treated to some unusual public art.

On her property that borders the new road, Mildred Friedman has constructed 37 wood sculptures that she likes to call "my troops." Brightly painted, each one in the row stands as an individual achievement, different from the others, but still part of the attractive total.

Rather than found sculpture, Mrs. Friedman's troops are more scrap sculpture or challenge sculpture.

For many years, the artist, painter, sculptor and fiber worker, has been buying from one lumber yard. She asked if she could collect and carry

away the scraps at the end of the week. That's what the 37 sculptures are made of, the odds and ends of the lumber yard. But, they work very well, because Mrs. Friedman is a trained artist and art teacher who can put the pieces together with a flair and a balance that is appealing.

IN ONE, SHE EVEN USED a small discarded window frame and even added a hint of a roof over it.

She walked down the 100 foot row of the works, which she started about February, and said, "I feel mopey because it's all over."

The project began when she was looking for new challenge. Mrs. Friedman is the type of artist who likes to move on once she has pursued one idea or one medium in depth. Consequently, she's an inveterate experimenter — a person who enjoys departing from the traditional.

She built the outdoor sculptures, one by one, in her studio at 16909 Livernois in Detroit. When the idea to glue them together didn't work, she switched to nails. Each was transported to the back yard of the Franklin home in the back of a station wagon. Each also was given a coat of paint in the yard — red, blue, yellow, black or white. Just to add to the fun, there's one dark green one in the middle of the row and a blue-purple at the end.

Mr. Friedman helped his artist-wife by taking over the responsibility of anchoring them securely to two by fours under ground.

"THEY'RE MY PEOPLE," Mrs. Friedman said. "The people working on the road come over and ask me what these things are that look like people."

She thought for a moment and then added, "I still believe that while they

are fun, they are good forms and good design. I'm a compulsive worker and I do a lot of work quickly."

Not only is she a compulsive and prolific worker, Mrs. Friedman is versatile.

When Jim Hale of the Artists Group represented her (he has since moved to Florida to start a new business), he had many requests for landscapes. Mrs. Friedman accommodated with many landscapes, which sold fast.

She stood in her back yard looking at the work going along on Telegraph and her sculptures which will be seen, or at least partially seen, by the motorists and wondered where she would find her next challenge.

And then, there was just a hint that there might be a much taller, more elaborate companion piece — a sort of leader for the troops.

Admission to the Tuesday program is \$3. Tickets are available at the door.



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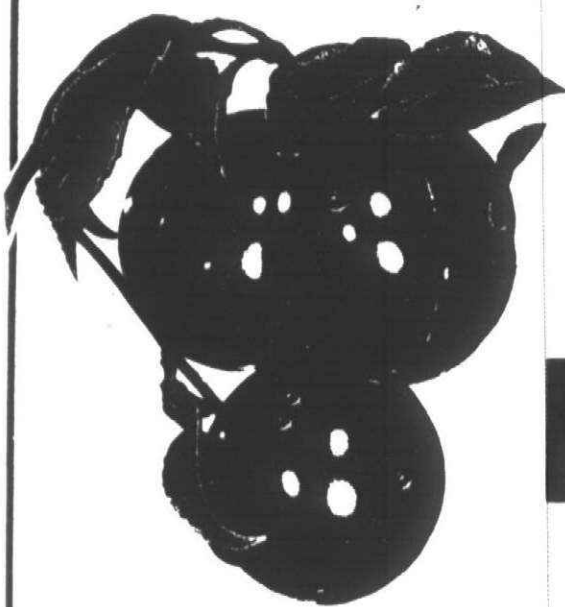
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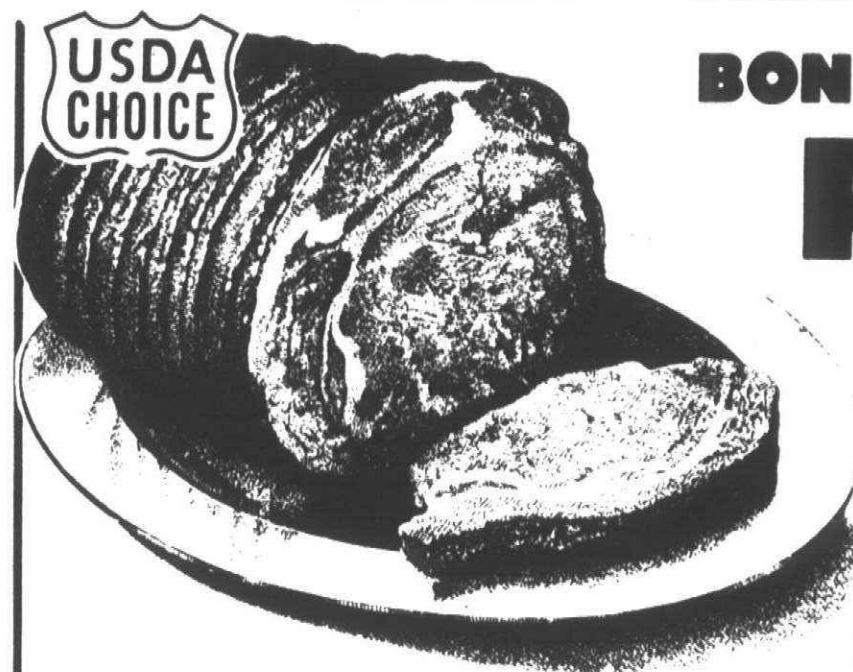
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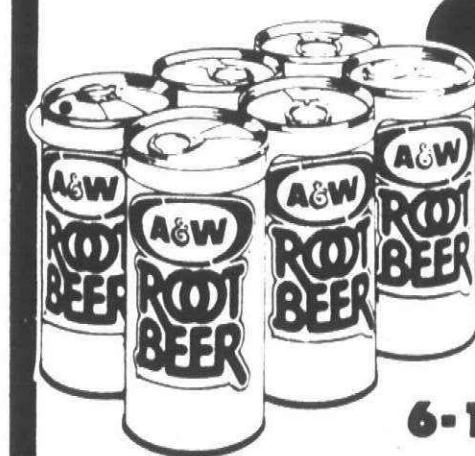


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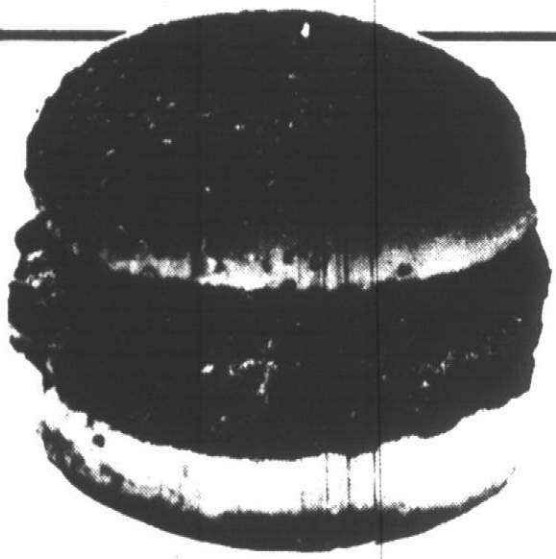
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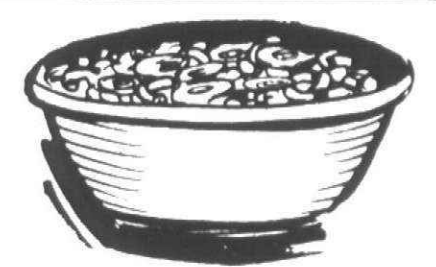
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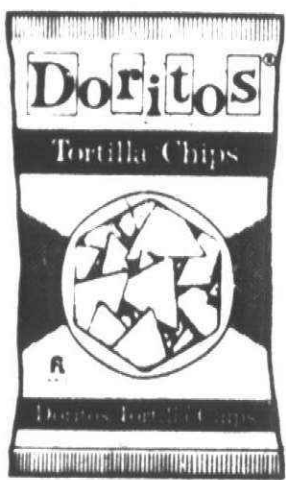
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Legal marijuana? It could soon become a reality

The use of marijuana, under certain circumstances, could soon be legal in Michigan.

The Michigan Senate recently passed a bill to allow the medical use of marijuana for cancer patients throughout the state.

The final roll call showed 29 Senators voting for legalizing marijuana for medical purposes, with only five voting no.

Included in the 29 affirmative votes were Senators Robert Geake, R-Northville, whose district includes Plymouth and Livonia; Ed Pierce, D-Ann Arbor; and Doug Ross, D-Oak Park, whose district includes Farmington and Southfield.

Senate Bill 185 was introduced by Sen. Steve Monsma, D-Grand Rapids.

THE MEDICAL marijuana bill follows on the heels of a bill passed by the Senate in May which would decriminalize the use of small amounts of marijuana (less than 30 grams) in the privacy of one's home.

The bill passed the Senate by a 20-14 vote with Geake voting against it, Pierce and Ross in favor.

Both bills must now go before the Michigan House where it is generally conceded that both will pass because of an influx of new representatives who have shown a favorable attitude toward medical use and decriminalization.

In a telephone interview shortly after the medical marijuana bill's passage, Roger Winthrop, the Michigan coordinator for the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws (NORML), declared a victory for those who have worked to pass pro-marijuana laws.

"Monsma's bill should go a long way in helping those who suffer from the terrible side effects of chemotherapy and the pain of glaucoma to get relief," Winthrop said.

Dick Klaver, an administrative assistant to Monsma, said the bill's passage by the senate and the eventual passage by the house should help to standardize current medical use of marijuana throughout the state.

"There are several clinics in Michigan and elsewhere in the nation which have been fighting for the right to administer marijuana to their patients."

"WHAT THIS bill will establish is a program with the Food and Drug Ad-

ministration which will allow the legal use of marijuana by glaucoma and cancer patients who have received a prescription for the substance from their doctor," Klaver said.

Klaver explained that marijuana reduces the severe vomiting and stomach sickness, side effects of chemotherapy treatments administered to cancer patients. With glaucoma, Klaver added, the substance helps reduce the pressure on the afflicted person's eye.

"Seven other states already have passed similar medical marijuana bills, including New Mexico, which after months of paperwork has finally begun to receive a supply of marijuana from the federal government."

Klaver and Winthrop both agreed that the bill should pass the house without much trouble, but added that it could take months to get the clinical program worked out with the FDA which would start the flow of federally-grown marijuana to Michigan.

UNDER MONSMA'S bill, only licensed doctors would be allowed to prescribe marijuana to cancer and glaucoma patients.

The doctors also would be required to take delivery of the marijuana, because pharmacists would be prohibited from distributing the substance to the physicians' patients.

Klaver said he doubted there would be any problem with unauthorized persons getting marijuana from a physician's office without a prescription, or persons who do not suffer from cancer or glaucoma obtaining the substance illegally.

The decriminalization bill passed by the Senate (SB 65) was sponsored by Sen. Jerome Hart, D-Saginaw. The bill, if signed into law, will mandate a civil, rather than a criminal, penalty for those who use 30 grams of pot or less in their own homes.

Hart said he proposed the legislation to the senate "because there is a demonstrable need in the state to create a uniform method of dealing with those persons who wish to use small amounts of marijuana in their homes."

Current marijuana laws in Michigan are too "strict and enforced unfairly," he said. He believes the present system allows police officers too much discretion in enforcement.

"You might have a situation where a police officer pulls over a teenager for speeding and, when he does, notices a marijuana cigarette in the car."

"If the teenager is in any way belliger-

ent to the cop, he'll get busted. If the kid is respectful to the cop, chances are the officer will ignore the marijuana and let him go. That type of enforcement I feel is very unfair."

HART SAID the bill was necessary from another standpoint.

"There are 36 million Americans who have smoked marijuana at one time or another, 15 million of which smoke it regularly. With these kind of statistics, it's stupid to keep busting people for marijuana and giving them criminal records."

Hart said he was opposed to the state legalization of marijuana because he felt the federal government should handle the issue.

"This type of thing needs to be uniform throughout the country. When you decide to legalize marijuana, you have to decide upon a way of marketing it. The only practical way would be for the federal government to commission farmers throughout the country to

grow it, then package it and rate the stuff according to its potency, and sell and tax it through state approved facilities."

Although Hart said the Monsma bill would easily pass through the house after the summer recess, he said he expected "one hell of a fight" to get his bill through the same body.

"Similar bills like mine went down in the house by three votes a couple of years ago, and by one vote this year. Even with the new reps this year it still could be a hell of a battle to get it passed."

Winthrop said this year's decriminalization was the 20th such bill introduced in the Michigan Legislature in the past 11 years.

"Few people know there have been 20 attempts to get this through the house and senate. In fact we conducted a poll a while back which showed few senators knew that 20 decrim bills have been introduced in Michigan."

"The first 16 died in committee, the

17th lost by five votes, the 18th by three, and the 19th by one. So you can see, we're getting closer to passage every year."

Winthrop also expects a tough fight to get the decriminalization bill passed by the house.

"This is a very emotional issue in Michigan and always has been. There are a lot of reps in the house who feel very strongly on the issue, whether they are for or against it."

"I do think the discussion on the bill will be conducted in a better tone than

it has been in previous years. We shouldn't have anybody hitting anyone else over the head with ashtrays like we had a couple of years ago."

Even if the bill fails to pass the House for the 20th time, Winthrop said NORML will work to initiate another marijuana decriminalization bill after the summer recess is over.

"If this one bites the dust, we'll introduce another, and another, and another. We're going to keep fighting until this thing gets passed. We've worked too hard and too long to give up now."

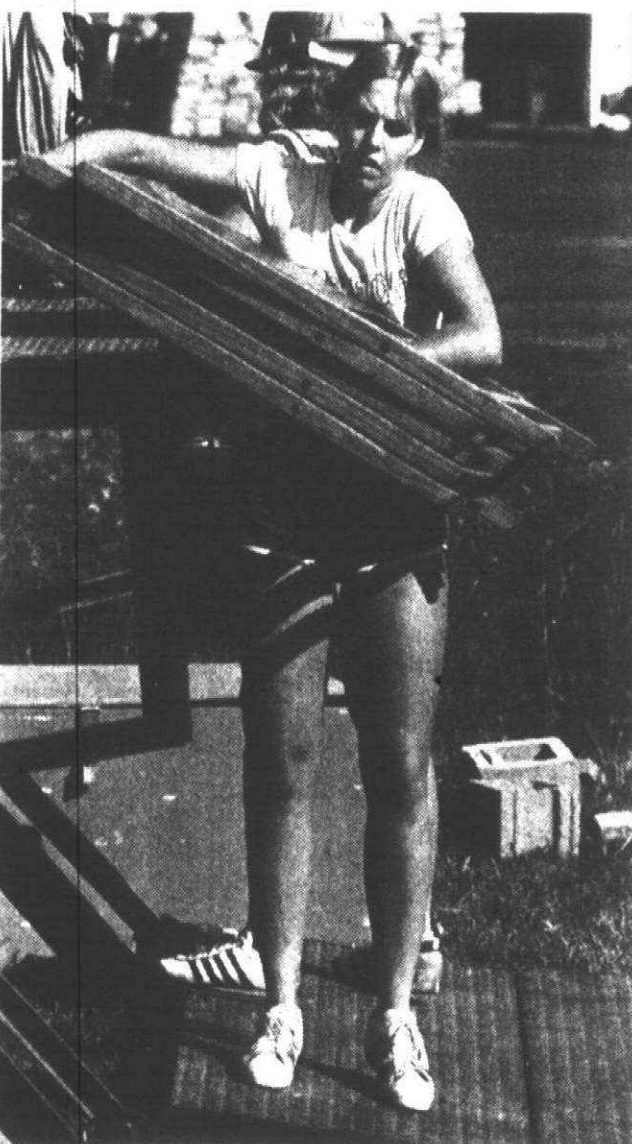

Michael Coletta, 9, played *Neapolitan Nights* on his accordion and Andy Hoover, 9, performed a series of card tricks.

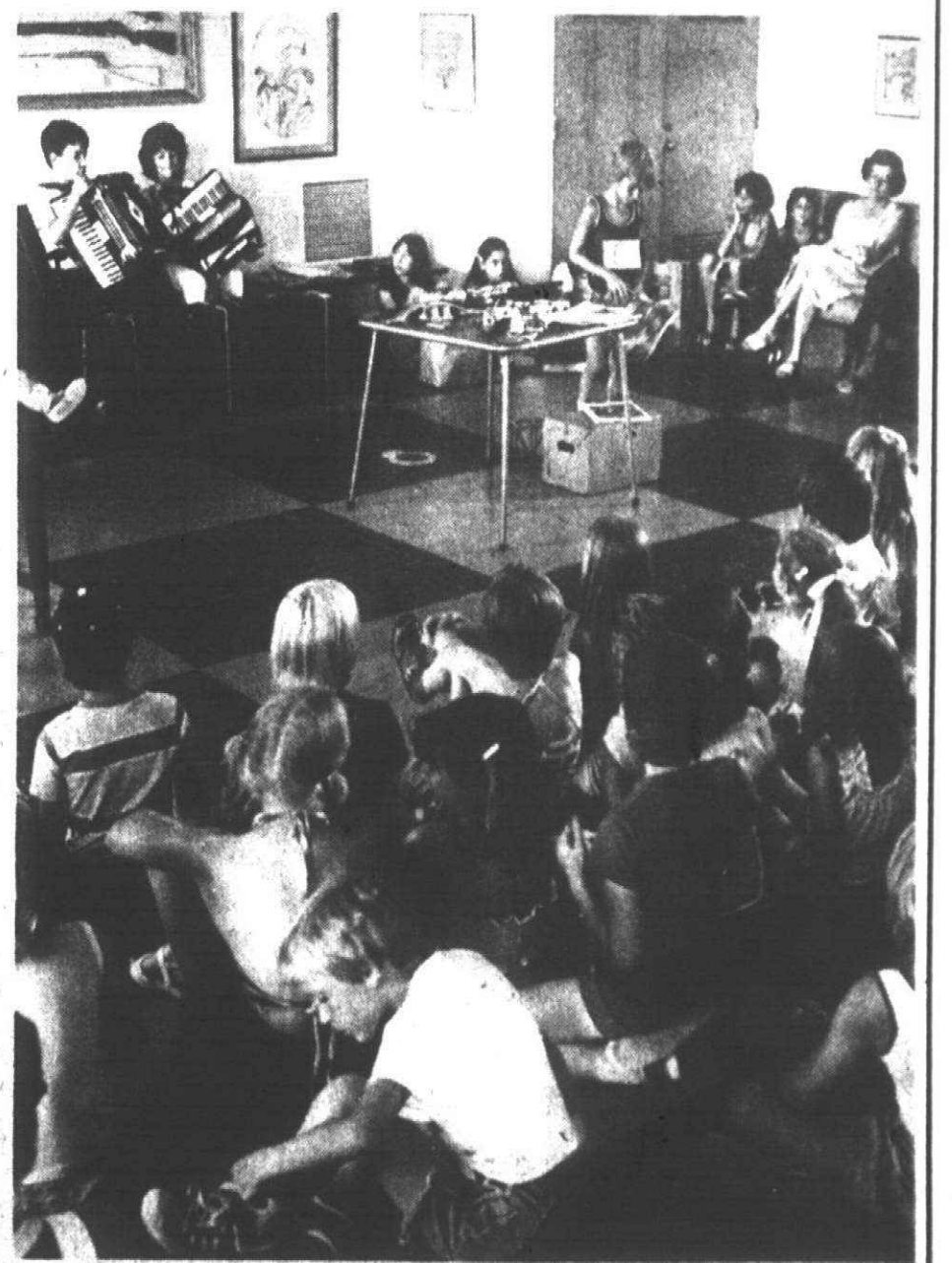

THE ERIKSSON volunteers serve

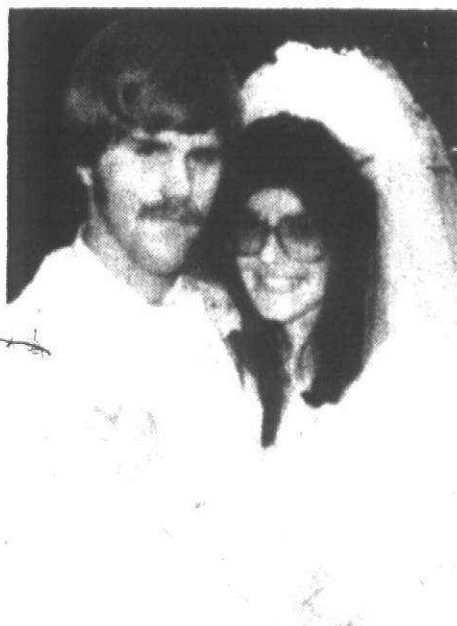
mainly as teacher assistants. Each teacher recruits her own group. They range from 15 to 20 mothers for each class.

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Jobs down, Manpower study says

Employers in metropolitan Detroit have trimmed their employment expectations for the next three months from the levels recorded at this time one year ago, according to a survey conducted by Manpower, a temporary help firm.

Jerry Heller, owner of the Detroit Manpower office, said, "Overall, 12 percent of the employers surveyed plan to increase employment during the third quarter, (July, August, September), compared to the 32 percent with similar plans of one year ago.

"Another 5 percent expect reduced employment during the coming months while 78 percent plan to maintain current levels. The remainder, 5 percent, are unsure of their plans.

"One year ago, 5 percent expected reduced employment, 61 percent planned no changes, and 2 percent were unsure."

DURING COMING months, employment increases are expected by employers in the durable goods manufacturing, and services sectors of the local economy.

Reduced employment is expected in the building trades, with all other areas of the local economy expecting generally stable employment levels.

The latest outlook is also below that measured three months ago, when 22 percent expected increases, 10 percent forecast reductions and 66 percent planned no changes. Then, 2 percent were unsure of their plans.

NATIONALLY, strong evidence of an impending drop in employment growth, a slowdown in the hiring pace, is indicated.

Overall, 29 percent of the employers polled plan increased employment during the third quarter, down from the 34 percent with similar plans of one year ago.

Another 7 percent plan decreased employment, up slightly from 6 percent of one year ago, while 61 percent expect no changes in current levels, up from 57 percent of last year.

Three percent of those questioned in each survey were unsure of their plans.

The slowdown in the hiring pace, coming traditionally at a time of clear gains in hiring, is indicated in all regions of the country and all sectors of the economy. The latest survey results report the first reductions in hiring expectations recorded in several years.

The slowdown, however, was expected; it follows 13 consecutive quarters of dramatically increased employment. More than 6 million workers were added to U.S. payrolls in the last two years alone.

THE HIRING slowdown in this quarter's expectations is most evident in the Northeast and Midwest, with lesser declines expected in the West and South.

The slowdown is indicated from reports of eight of the 10 economic sectors included in the survey. Only in the mining and public administration sectors are current hiring expectations above the levels of one year ago.

The slowdown is most severely indicated by employers in the wholesale-retail and construction trades.

Of the construction employers surveyed, 42 percent expected increases during the coming months, down from the 51 percent of one year ago. Another 7 percent anticipate declines, up from 5 percent in 1978, while 48 percent plan no changes, above the 41 percent of last year. Three percent of those polled in each survey were unsure of their plans.

A significant slowdown is also apparent in the fields of real estate-finance-insurance, least affected by seasonal factors. Substantially fewer work force additions are expected by this sector's employers during the coming months than during previous third quarters.

Currently, 30 percent of those polled expect to increase hiring, while 6 percent plan decreases, 61 percent no changes and 3 percent are uncertain; one year ago, 35 percent expected increases, 3 percent decreases, 60 percent no changes, and 2 percent were uncertain.

Tickets for Tut in Toronto available in Windsor soon

If you want tickets for the King Tut exhibition this fall in Toronto, you must plan a trip to Windsor for Aug. 1.

The Treasures of Tutankhamun, which has drawn record crowds in seven American cities during the last year, will be shown Nov. 1. through Dec. 31 at the Art Gallery of Ontario on 317 Dundas St. W. in Toronto. This is the show's last stop in North America.

It is being brought to Canada by the Canadian government, so the

gallery must make it as available as possible to all Canadians.

To achieve this goal, the gallery has opted for a mail-order system that gives equal opportunity to prospective ticket buyers everywhere in the country.

ON WEDNESDAY, AUG. 1, order forms will be available at selected stores of Canada's four major department store chains: Eatons, Simpsons, The Bay, and Simpson-Sears.

Simpson's and Simpson's Sears will pass out the forms in Windsor. Each person will be given a single order form that will allow the mail order purchase of four tickets.

There will probably be a lineup when the store opens, but the line should move quickly since no money is changing hands there. Judy Johns of the Art Gallery of Ontario expects the Windsor supply to last four or five days, although it could go faster.

"There are 480,000 tickets available to the public and 8,000 of them, or 2,000 ticket forms, have been allotted to Windsor," she said. "It's unfortunate that we have to limit tickets in any way, and we certainly don't want to exclude our American friends in border cities."

"Unfortunately, every city that has shown this exhibit has been forced to limit the number of viewers in some way."

The ticket system developed by trial and error as the show moved around the U.S.: In Washington, Chicago, New Orleans, and Seattle, viewers stood in line on the day they wanted to get in, sometimes as long as eight hours.

Detroiters who traveled to Chicago remember that the tickets were passed out to the first people in line in the morning, and ticket holders came back several hours later as it was time for them to go in.

Los Angeles, New York and San Francisco tried the mail order system. I understand that prospective viewers had to travel to New York for their ticket and go back again for the show. Canada is trying the mail-order system, but with greater access.

A small percentage of tickets, 12,000 or less that 2 percent will be sold in tour packages co-sponsored by the four department stores and the American Express Co. Miss Johns says that this was done as a service, and that it probably won't make any money for the tour operators.

These tours are available only in Canada, so again you must go to Windsor.

How does the mail order system work?

"When you fill in the order form, you will be asked to make some choices, in order of preference," Miss Johns said. "Do you want to go in the morning, afternoon or evening? What day of the week? In November of December? If you can't get your choice, will you take whatever you can get?"

THE ORDER FORM will be sent, along with your money, to a post office box. Your tickets will arrive within about six weeks.

The tickets cost \$3.50 each. There is a \$1 additional charge for mailing and handling each order.

The Treasures of Tutankhamun include 55 objects from the tomb of this pharaoh. I visited his tomb in the Valley of the Kings in Egypt this spring and saw many golden artifacts from the tomb at the Egyptian Museum in Cairo.

There is only one word for these treasures: splendid.

There is a spinoff from this exhibit which surprised everybody. You've heard often enough that ordinary people don't like art. Apparently they do. Tut outdrew all the baseball games combined when it was in Chicago.

If you want more information on the Toronto exhibit, call the Tut Hot Line in Toronto at 1-416-363-4900. And if you are inclined to grumble about going to Windsor for tickets in the summer, just remember that November and December would be the wrong months to stand outside in line there.

From Miami

Having wonderful time; wish you were there

The city of Miami is like the Mason-Dixon line. It separates two worlds.

North is the Gold Coast, a 10-mile-wide beach stretching to Palm Beach. South is Key Biscayne and Coconut Grove. This whole stretch of coastline, from Palm Beach to the Grove, is only 100 miles and you can reach either end of it in an hour from downtown Miami.

Start your visit in the center of Miami at the mammoth Omni International Hotel. The Omni, with its shopping plaza, convention center and amusement park, begins to compete with Disney World — and that's exactly what the builders had in mind.

The International Festival, which entertains travelers of all ages, is held here.

Miami is still the back door to the Everglades, and it still hosts many famous old attractions: Collins Avenue shopping, Hialeah Racetrack, night clubs and Wolfie's restaurants.

Three new attractions are Bayfront Park and the Torch of Friendship, a memorial to John F. Kennedy, on Biscayne Boulevard; the Cuban Refugee Center, called the Freedom Tower, in Miami's revitalized inner city; and the rejuvenated Port of Old Miami, where the dockyards may remind you of New York.

When you are ready to tour the northern leg of the Gold Coast, drive directly to Palm Beach. Follow Biscayne Boulevard, which leaves each town along the way with a separate personality, or follow Interstate 95, which merges all the Gold Coast towns into one.

After you ogle the mansions along the way, consider the sumptuous \$9.95 buffet lunch at The Breakers in Palm Beach, where they serve free champagne beside the pool. This lovingly-maintained 1920s hotel, with ceiling friezes of roccoco cupids and garlands, is still full of old-world craftsmanship.

Tour the nearby Henry Flagler Museum. Flagler's railroad opened Florida from Jacksonville to Palm Beach during the 1920s.

A LEISURELY DRIVE back to Miami will probably include a half-way stop at Fort Lauderdale. This city is known as a hangout for college students, but it has had other lives. Rum-runners ran fast boats 45 minutes to Bimini from this spot, and the last piracy hanging took place here in 1931.

The road south takes you through

Dania, famous for its antique shops; Hollywood, where Las-Vegas-style stars appear at the Diplomat Hotel; and the famous Miami Beach.

Drive through the small hotel communities of Miami Beach. In the morning, old-fashioned rockers line the front stoops, waiting for residents to bring their shopping bags home for lunch.

Elderly men and women chat and beg rides on street corners. Shops and restaurants advertise in Hebrew and English.

In the waterway nearby, houseboats used for the "Surfside Six" television episodes ride at anchor across from the Eden Roc, the Doral and the Fountainbleau hotels on what is known as Hotel Row.

The second leg of your Gold Coast trip takes you south across the Rickenbacker Causeway to Key Biscayne. The Key was almost uninhabited in 1947, but it now boasts the 1,000-acre Crandon Park with its zoo, miniature railroad, golf courses, beaches and cabanas.

Miamians lunch, fish and launch small boats from the causeway, where the International Oceanographic Foundation does its serious research into aquatic animal and plant life.

The causeway is also the site of the Miami Seaquarium, where dolphins play for delighted audiences, and Planet Ocean, which features Florida's only iceberg. You can listen to ship traffic, ride a submarine or watch the birth of the ocean at this latter facility.

KEY BISCAYNE HAS rows of condominiums worth more than the \$5 million paid for Florida in the first place.

One highlight of the area is the Royal Biscayne Hotel, which remains like a Caribbean island retreat with its secluded beach, lush interiors designed by Dorothy Draper, thatched-roofed bar and poolside lunch tables. Fans hope that it won't lose its character during the planned renovation of 1980-81.

Grandeur remains the order of the day a short drive away at Viscaya, which looks to Detroiters like Meadow Brook Hall, Rose Terrace and Fria Lane Manor all rolled into one. James Deering of the International Harvester Co. hired 1,000 artisans to build this 70-room house for almost \$15 million in 1912. Some people believe it is the finest private home in America.

Gardens, sculpture, grottos and pools draw visitors to the outdoors, where an ornately carved cement barge is used as a breakwater. Tour boats carry visitors to the house from Miami.

If you are lucky, you will be near the Jamaica Inn on Key Biscayne when a local wine distributor serves free wine and cheese. The Inn has a fine collection of model ships and a famous painting of the last 131-gun warship built by His Majesty's Navy in 1852.

Drive or rent bicycles for a side trip to Cape Florida State Park from which Indians made raids on early settlers in 1836. The lighthouse and museum are open to sightseers. The beach is good.

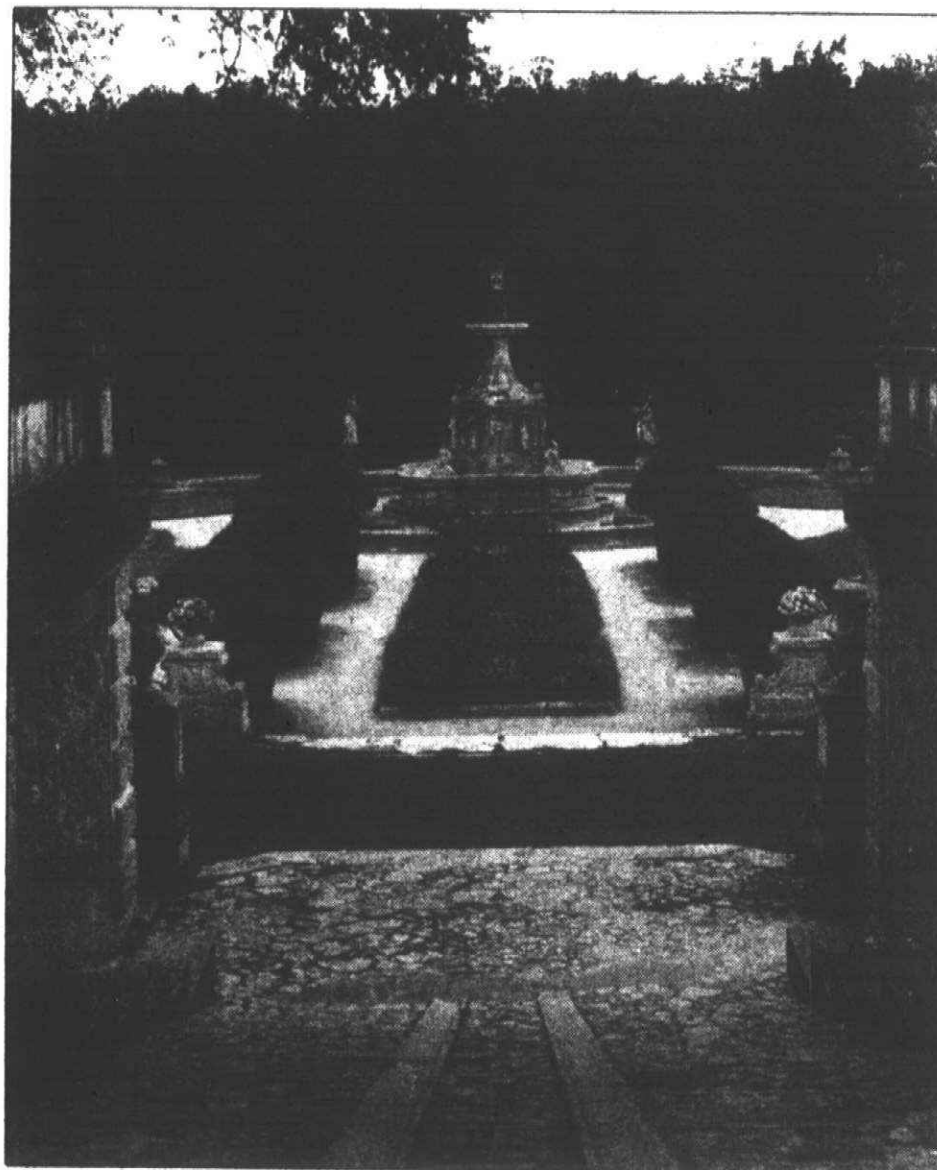
If you still think of fire when you think of Coconut Grove, think again. The image of this quaint city, south of Miami, is changing again.

Once the Haight-Asbury of Miami, the town now features narrow, winding streets with original gas lights and boutique shopping. The area, known as Miami's artist colony, is also a home for boaters. The Kinner Key Marina offers a well-run service to boaters without walking distance of shops and restaurants.

Now that you have seen the Gold Coast north to Palm Beach and south to Coconut Grove, there is one more stop to make on your way back to the city.

Go to the Rusty Pelican restaurant at dusk. It is a medium-priced restaurant on the causeway. Watch from a window table as the lights of Miami go on across Biscayne Bay. People who know say that the New England Chowder here is the best south of Boston. Customers often tie their boats nearby and come in wearing boatshoes.

If you stay long enough over a pina colada or glass of wine, you can watch the moon over Miami one more time.

Va., who will play and lead sing-alongs on his 135-year-old hammered dulcimer, and the Schantz Organ Co. from Orrville, Ohio which will display cathedral pipes ranging from pencil-size to 40 feet long in the Grist Mill on the Trail. Austin Pease, a Schantz employee, will demonstrate voicing or how a pipe is pitched.
