Edison reacts to nuclear age

Imagine a giant scaffolding running down the middle of the Detroit River. Now, picture huge buckets carrying river water along the scaffolding, forming an elongated water wheel.

Sound crazy? Well, that's just one of the suggestions on how to produce new forms of energy that Detroit Edison receives from area consumers. And believe it or not, Edison representatives check out all suggestions they receive.

"Chances are we'll be as dependent on the electric companies in future as we are today - no matter what the source generating that electricity is," said Saul Waldman, manager of public affairs for Edison.

"Our philosophy is that we'll produce electricity any way we can that is reliable, safe, clean and economical," he added, noting that a finding low-cost energy source is the "primary empha-

New sources of energy that Edison is investigating include garbage, chicken fat, bacon grease, peat, solar and wind power.

"Our solar program is the largest in Michigan, perhaps the largest in the Midwest. And we're still working on the winds with Consumers in western Michigan," said Jim Lagowski, director

of area development for Edison. Despite those efforts, Edison officials believe the immediate future for energy lies in the Fermi II nuclear

plant that Edison is building in the Monroe area of its Wayne Division. That division roughly covers the area from Napier Road in the west to Inkster. Road in the east, and from Eight Mile in the north to just south of Mon-

But the operation of Fermi II will mushroom beyond the boundaries of the Wayne Division. Fermi II will generate 1.1 million kilowatts of power when it is fully operational. While that power will be used primarily by residents and businesses in the Wayne Division, other divisions in counties such as Oakland will be able to use electricity now being consumed by the Wayne Di-


Power also will be diverted to the Northern Michigan Electric Cooperative at Boyne City and to the Wolverine Electric Cooperative in Big Rapids. Both cooperatives are funding 20 percent of the builing cost for Fermi II.

That cost is expected to top \$1 billion when the plant is completed in 1982. Planning for the project began in 1968; construction started in October 1970.

Nine years later, representatives of the media in the Wayne division were invited last October by Edison to tour Fermi II, which is now 90 percent com-



Volunteers take on cop's life for mere peanuts

The pay is abysmal, but that doesn't worry Vicki Hebda. She's worked almost a year now and is yet to receive her promised annual wage - a \$1 check.

But she never planned on making a fortune when she applied for a reserve job with the Canton Police Department.

As a volunteer, Mrs. Hebda, 26, performs many of the tasks that certified patrol officers would do in a department without a reserve program. She files records. She helps dispatch cars. And, sometimes, she accompanies certified police officers on the road.

Once she assisted in the arrest of a narcotics dealer. On another occasion, she witnessed the arrest of a an unruly robbery suspect, who began throwing punches at everyone around him. It took five police officers to subdue the man.

"I didn't do much," confessed the mother of two. But she also hasn't allowed the possibility of danger to dissuade her

from the volunteer job.

"This is something I've always wanted to do," she said of police work. "So, when I heard of the program I thought, what better way to find out if this was something I wanted." She may consider it as a possible occupation when youngest daughter

Andrea, 21/2, starts school.

AS ONE of nine Canton residents working on a volunteer basis, she logs an average of 20 hours a month for the department.


Six others who began as volunteers almost a year ago have earned police certification by taking classes at police academies. They now work as certified reserves on a part-time basis for a pay of \$3.82 an

Police Chief Jerry Cox estimates that volunteers saved the department \$46,000 last year.

They logged 3,550 hours on the road, behind desks and in record-keeping rooms. Certified patrol officers, who are paid \$9.18 an hour on straight time, would have absorbed those hours at a time-and-a-half rate if the volunteer program had not been established, he said.

Cox plans to expand the number of volunteers to 30 by the end of this year. He estimates that move will save the department \$80,000 in 1980. For a young department with a tight operating budget, the savings are

Although the department's \$1.2 million budget funds salaries for 24 full-time patrol officers, Cox maintains that a community of Canton's size, about 40,000, should employ 80. Eight of the 24 officers' slots are new positions which the township board must authorize before hiring (Continued on page 5A)

Supervisor Noel Culbert has proposed the formation of a statewide farmland preservation council.

'There's a need for this council so the right hand knows what the left is doing," the supervisor said.

"You know that Canton is not the only community in the state that's interested in farmland preservation. The time is ripe to sit down with all the people as a collective force."

Culbert mentioned the idea of forming the statewide organization at last week's joint meeting between the township board and planning commission. He said officials were receptive to the

The supervisor plans to place the proposal on the agenda of Tuesday's regular township board meeting for possible action by trustees.




This bulletin board graphically shows WSDP's new listening range.

Cost of doing business is high at area agency

Local officials hoping to start their own agency for distribution of senior citizen grants say administration costs of the agency currently making allotments are exorbitant

But no one, except prehaps the agency's director, seems to know how much the Detroit-Wayne County Area Agency on Aging (AAA) is receiving from state and federal sources or how much it is distrib-

Representatives from some 24 suburban communities last week attended a meeting called by Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara at which it was revealed that approximately 11/2 million is being spent by the AAA on administration costs alone.

That figure was confirmed by Irene Smith of the Michigan Office of Services to Aging (OSA). She said the OSA gives the area agency \$5.7 million per year, although the AAA could also be receiving funds from other state or federal sources. The high administrative costs are apparently allowable through regulations which say the agency can take 8.5 percent of funding for such programs as senior citizen nutrition, but up to 25 percent from funding programs such as senior citizens' home services.

McNamara, who initiated the move to develop a suburban agency, said he did not know what percentage of funds were being spent by the AAA on administration and was unable to get that information. The Livonia mayor, with confirmation from the state officials, told the representatives who attended the meeting that the AAA maintained at least 40 employees.

"FRED FERRIS (director of the AAA) even has a library with a full-time librarian," McNamara said. But the mayor admitted that his knowledge of the AAA's budget was sketchy. "I'm never sure

what to ask of Ferris," he said. Ferris could not be reached for comment or confirmation of the speculations about his budget. Whatever the budget may be, the formula the AAA uses to allocate funds is based on a formula of 70 percent for Detroit and 30 percent for the out-coun-

McNamara said he believes the formula, derived from the 1970 census will be changed when the figures from the 1980 census reveal huge gains in sub-

urban population. That's one reason, he said, why Detroit Mayor Coleman Young has announced his intention to pull the city out of the AAA and set up his own funding agency. "That way Detroit won't lose funds."

In McNamara's invitation to communities to attend the planning meeting, he said he was concerned that funding for the suburbs would be affected if Detroit is allowed to start its own agency.

McNamara's plan to break away from the AAA would involve the formation of a non-profit corporation. "Anyone of the communities that want to participate would have a member on a board. The board would hire a director," McNamara said.

The mayor acknowledged that the state might push for the choice of director to be Fred Ferris, since the current AAA would have to disband without the participation of either Detroit or the sub-

Most of the community representatives who attended the meeting indicated interest and support for the plan. Westland, however, remained noncommittal, possibly because it is trying to develop its own home services program for senior citizens with the help of Comprehensive Employment Training Act (federally subsidized) employees from other participating communities.

The proposed program is being worked on with the help of the Wayne County Office on Aging, which receives money from the AAA to implement programs in communities with successful grant ap-

Among the strongest supporters of the local agency concept is Canton Township, whose officials have long been critical of the AAA.

This year, the township received only a minute portion of the \$48,000 it requested in conjunction with four other communities in order to start a home services program for senior citizens. "We can't do any worse than what we've got," Canton Supervisor Noel Culbert said.

McNamara - whose city received one of the highest allotments (about \$50,000) of any out-county community - said the next step would be to discuss the proposal with Wayne County Board of Commissioner out-county representatives and then with suburban legislators.

He said an application to start the agency would have to be filed with the state by March 1. The agency could conceivably be in operation by Oct. 1.

impressions of the tour. And recognizing the impact energy will have on our future lifestyles, we chose to use today's Suburban Life section to tell you about the plant and how it will operate. Caskey's pictures also offer a rare look inside the plant, which will be closed to the public once it is operating.

In preparing this report, we found ourselves still getting excited three months later as we reviewed memories of the size and complexity of Fermi II.

Caskey compared his impressions of the cooling towers and reactor building with his work during the mid-'60s in the Vertical Assembly Building (VAB) on Cape Kennedy.

"The VAB was the world's largest building that housed the Saturn V rockets. I had the same feeling of hugeness when we visited Fermi II," said Caskey. "I felt dwarfed by man's ability to create monumental structures."

The "big thing," we both agreed, was

that "with 90 percent of the work completed, it still looks as if there is so much left to do.

Our tour started in the visitor center. As we entered, a member of the press tapped me on the shoulder.

"You must be feeling like Jane Fonda right now," he said, refering to the "China Syndrome." Fonda starred as a reporter in that popular motion picture about a nuclear plant that experiences a "melt down" situation.

A melt down refers to the possibility of the reactor's core of nuclear fuel melting. According to the theory, nothing could stop a melt down from going right through the earth - all the way

Security and safety were readily evident on our tour. Gates and fencing surround the plant site, which was formerly a marsh land. A guard accompanied us throughout the tour, reporting our movements via shortwave and counting heads each time we entered and

"I was behind the group most of the time, with a security guard at my side who was anxious for me to finish taking pictures and catch up with the group," said Caskey.

Alternating areas of light and dark and non-reflective concrete structures created photographic nightmares for Caskey. The reactor building was somewhat gloomy and the dust from construction on the fifth floor of the reactor building aggrevated this reporter's allergies. But workers seemed oblivious to the gloom and dust.

Bill White, plant superintendent, told us that they have about one or two accidents each year. There were 3,100 workers at the plant last summer. By fall, the number of workers had dropped to about 1,800. It will take about 125 people to operate the plant.

The safety of nuclear power is the subject of heated debate, which Edison officials realize.

DESPITE THE PAY of \$1 a year, Cox foresees no problem in finding more volunteers to work for the de-

He still has applications from 50 people who vied for the volunteer posts last year. Cox says he will accept no new applications until all current applicants are interviewed and tested.

Volunteers will not be given an opportunity for police certification because of financial woes, Cox said. Also, the Canton police officers' contract prohibits the sending of future volunteers to the police academy unless they are hired full-time, according to Patrolman James Hanna, union president.

"We would rather have full-time officers, but the money is apparently not there," Hanna said. He is concerned that the new reserves may not have as extensive training as the former

with volunteer reserves generally, Hanna said; but if the department goes ahead with a contemplated cadet program, the union would like the reserve units dropped.

If and when new applications for volunteers are accepted, Cox says he may consider persons who live outside Canton Township if they offer expertise in first aid or other areas. The township board recently lifted a residency requirement for police volunteers - the only township workers required to live in the township.

THE VOLUNTEERS receive instruction in police work, including firearm safety and use. Although they sometimes ride in patrol cars as the second person on duty, Cox says they are told to man radios and stay out of the way if trouble breaks out. Guns are in the cars for use in emergencies.

Cox says many people who apply for volunteer police jobs consider law enforcement as a possible future line of work. Others want to provide a community service.





Just about all of us know someone who has died or will die of cancer. Some of us unknowingly have

If you don't yet know someone with the disease.

Cancer is a gruesome reality. Living with it, admitting it's there, may be the most difficult struggle

We remember Hubert Humphrey addressing Congress for the final time. His unforgettable spirit was still intact, but his body was gutted by the disease. We knew the "happy warrior" was going to lose the battle.

We remember John Wayne at the Academy awards vowing to fight on. He had beat the "Big C" once, he would do it again, he pledged. Days later he died.

One of the bravest persons I've ever known was reporter Martha Mahan. She fought, and lived, with cancer for 10 years. But never did she lose heart.

Operation after operation she would return to work, gutsy as ever, never complaining, many times laughing and joking about it — much to the dismay of some co-workers who couldn't understand such spirit.

Classic decision-making

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education was almost classic in its process of deciding whether to realign the sixth and ninth grades.

By classic I mean representative or typical, not good.

The school board was asked Jan. 14 to approve moving the ninth grades' from Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools to the middle schools and moving the sixth grade from the middle schools to the elemen-

Superintendent John Hoben and his cabinet said the grade shifting would relieve the already over-crowded condition at the high schools and avoid the need to build more classrooms.

The administration's idea was to move students rather then build space for students to occupy.

Board members debated the amount of money that would be saved. The savings quoted ranged from \$5 million to \$10 million.

Handling student growth through 1988 is going to cost more for operation and debt service. Hoben argued that grade realign ment would lower the amount of increased taxes needed by about 1.5 mills.

Although trustees couldn't agree on the amount of savings, they agreed realignment would result in a lower bond issue and a lower operating budget compared to building classes.

Trustees against realignment were Steve Harper, Elaine Kirchgatter, Sylvia Stetz and Dick Arlen. They felt realignment would destroy the middle school program and did not represent a bargain for taxpayers.

Tom Yack, Carol Davis and Flossie Tonda were in favor of realignment. They felt a shifting of grades would not destroy the middle school program and that the money saved would help persuade voters to approve the bond issue.

None of the seven trustees were against the middle school program.

THE MAJOR ARGUMENT raised was that realignment would destroy the middle school program program.

The middle school philosophy was developed to deal with the growth stage spanning the transition from childhood to adolescence - to prevent the student's childhood from being taken away prematurely. The elements of middle school include flexible scheduling, variable group sizes and team

A junior high is generally defined as replica of a high school which aims at speeding up the maturation of the student. Its elements include a six-period day, standard class sizes, and one teacher per classroom.

Mike Homes, assistant superintendent of instruction, was among those arguing that a middle school program was dependent on grade alignment that the program would be about the cided realignment should be done same for grades seven to nine as it now is for grades six to eight

But middle school principals Bob Smith, Jerry Elston and Gus Gorguze argued that a junior high would result from a seven-nine alignment with the middle school system being destroyed.

The principals and Harper, Stetz, Arlen and Kirchgatter also argued that the ninth-graders would lose many programs if moved from the high schools to a middle school - particulary in the areas of industrial arts, language and science where labs and special equipment are needed.

The answers from Yack, Davis and Tonda included: Ninth-graders now are losing choices because of over-crowding at the high schools; money could be put into the bond issue for labs/equipment to lessen program loss; and that some classes may be taken in the 10th grade instead of the ninth without any major loss to the student.

Smith and others suggested all ninthgraders could be pulled out of both high schools and placed in a single building. Central Middle was nominated as it will be available now that Lowell Junior High is being rented from Livonia

But Yack and others argued it would be a mistake to isolate a single grade into one building because students need to mix with others younger and older to be models and to have models.

THERE WERE, of course, other arguments by both sides but this gives you a flavor of the major issues at stake.

The school board earlier had taken a public opinion survey on the various alternatives which could be put into a bond issue. Among those alternatives

was grade realignment. The survey returns showed no strong feelings against realignment, pointed out Deanna Huff, citizens committee

chairman. And the survey didn't show any strong feelings against the middle school system. Those polled seemed to be saying

that alignment was a reasonable way of avoiding construction without any great harm being done. But oral opposition faced the board

when it began discussing the issue. Some parents objected. Then Bob Smith objected. And then Elston and Gorguze objected. Coupled with the principals' statements were written

statements against realignment from two middle school staffs.

In mid-December the board took a straw vote and by a 4-3 consensus de-More information was asked for, though, before the final vote was to be

Jan. 14 the additional information vote taken - this time 4-3 against realignment.

THE DIFFERENCE?

Mostly the oral arguments made by those in the audience.

Those arguments seemed to outweigh the view of the community represented in the opinion survey.

The information presented by the administration wasn't really much different from information known earlier.

The written answers asked for did include some negative information, but it was balanced by the financial information arguing for a grade shift

I think the real difference was the oral arguments that the middle school program was endangered by realign-

When the vote was taken, some trustees became confused and voted their conscience to "preserve" the middle school system. What seemed to be forgotten in the heat of the moment was that failure to realign would jack up the size of the bond issue by at least \$5

I think some trustees weren't really aware at the time of the realignment vote that they also were voting on raising the potential bond issue to near the \$20 million mark - give or take a mil-

For months the board has been trying to get away from the \$20 million figure and devise a bond package of somewhere between \$10 and \$15 mil-

The goal almost was reached, and would have if the realignment plan had been embraced. The result would have been a \$16 million package.

Maybe a package smaller than \$20 million still can emerge without realignment. But with all the options eliminated and chosen to date, there's

little room left to maneuver.

It's a complicated issue, and that's why I suspect some board members really didn't appreciate the consequence of the vote. And that's why I would not be shocked if the alignment issue came up for a third straw vote. The road towards a bond issue, at this point, is very rough rocky and narrowing very

Olympics' site can't change, says Roby

By W.W. EDGAR

Doug Roby, former president and member for 22 years of the U.S. Olymplc Committee, believes that talk of boycotting the 1980 games or removing them from Moscow is premature.

Furthermore, Roby doesn't believe a boycott would do much to upset the Russians and that it would be unfair to the athletes who have trained hard and

And, Roby added, the games could not be moved to another site this year.

SPEAKING FROM his home on Geddes Road in Ypsilanti, Roby stressed that President Carter has only threatened to boycott the Olympics.

Nothing definite has been done, he added, but the current discussion is

hurting the Winter Olympics which are to open in a few weeks at Lake Placid,

"Don't forget, the official name of the games is the Olympiad which means every four years. And the games are to be held in the final year of each four-year cycle.

"This would preclude any thought of postponing the games until 1981. They must be held this year. The Olympic Committee never would stand for a

Discussing the possibility of moving the games from Moscow to another site, he asked "Where to?"

"If you are thinking of Montreal, that is out of the question. Sure, the games were held there in 1976 but all the buildings erected for them are now part of a public housing program and would not be available."

For emphasis, he added: "We give every city awarded the games six years in which to prepare, so moving the games now couldn't even be considered."

ACCORDING TO Roby, the current discussion could hurt the winter games in Lake Placid after millions of dollars already have been spent there to stage these spectacular events.

"All the work could be placed in jeopardy, and the money, some \$100 million, would have been spent in vain. Much of this money has come from the state of New York, television and other private sources. It would be a shame to have anything like this happen.

The veteran official, who tried for years to get the games for the city of Detroit, also pointed out the unfairness of a boycott or cancellation of the games to the athletes.

"Don't forget, this is a once in a lifetime chance for them. They have trained hard and long to reach the goal of Olympic competition. If they would be faced with a delay until 1984, their chance possibly would be lost.

"They would have passed their peak in many cases and their long cherished dream be ruined. For that reason, the games should go on.'

ROBY ALSO CITED the fact that the games have been called off several times in the past. But in those cases a world war was being fought.

In some cases nations have withdrawn their teams, but the games still were staged.

And, Roby recalled, there was bitter feeling between Adolph Hitler and the U.S. in 1936. In fact, the feeling was so great that Willis Ward, now a judge in Detroit's Probate Court but then a University of Michigan track star chosen as a member of the U.S. team, refused to make the trip to Berlin.

Roby said it was "a sad state of affairs" that the Olympic Games were being made a political football. But he believes that, unless things get much worse in the cold war, the games will

School board unveils its goals for learning

Goals for the coming year have been set by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Trustees have agreed upon six areas of concentration after holding discussions in workshops and committee meetings.

"We believe working toward these goals will result in better schools for the students we serve," said Tom Yack, board president.

AMONG THE GOALS of the board are publication of their goals.

The board also wants to have at least three public opinion surveys each year and two public forums each year so that trustees can be better aware of the goals of the community.

Board members expect to spend a good deal of time out in schools and in the community.

They will attend as many school functions as time permits, said Yack, including graduations, award banquets, and PTO meetings.

Each trustee will be part of a speakers bureau to present programs on school topics to community groups.

They even plan to ride on school buses.

Appreciation is high on the board's list of goals, with official thanks to be given for staff members, school volunteers, and citizens serving on board

MEETINGS WITH local, state and federal government leaders also are planned.

The board also wants to inform the public on government issues important to Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Board members will be expected to maintain regular, well prepared attendance at board meetings and

workshops. Trustees also want to undertake personal training to improve their individual performance as representatives and policy makers and even plan to evaluate themselves as a board.

Policy making is the major responsibility of elected trustees, with administration, teachers, and support staff employ ed to carry out their decisions.

Board members want to review graduation requirements, student conduct and behavior, labor-management relations, program authoriza tion, staff selection and placement, and organizational structure.

Each of these policies will be studied. Then a workshop or discussion of an administrative report at a regular board meeting will occur. These meetings will be open to the public.

THE BOARD ALSO will of focus on the financial information system.

The board treasurer each year will review the budget with administration,

looking at expenditures and revenues of the school district, and report to the board.

Evaluation of the educational program has high priority to the board.

Trustees plan to schedule evaluation of each major instruct ional activity on a regular basis. Development of this evalua tion has been assigned to a board subcommittee.

Handling growth crucial in the '80s — superintendent

The major challenge facing Plymouth-Canton Community Schools in the decade ahead is finding a way to handle growth.

That assessment was made by Superintendent John M. Hoben as he took at look at the 1980s and what it holds in store for the school district.

With the unsettled economic picture and rising energy costs, Dr. Hoben added, accurate projections for the next

decade are difficult. > "In light of declining enrollment in our surrounding communities, we are cautious in planning.

"We expect to avoid over-building by using alternatives. We can use yearround school, rental of buildings from our neighbors, and shifting of grades to accommodate students i?n available spaces," Hoben continued.

"Renovation of existing buildings and purchase of portable classrooms are necessary to maintain reasonable class size and quality program."

ANOTHER CHALLENGE is associated with financing schools in the '80s.

"Most people feel there will be changes in financing public education, providing some relief to the property tax. The current state aid package with Sen. Faxon's weighted membership formula may, indeed, be the new approach to financing public schools in

The district's immediate challenge, he stressed, is to maintain and improve the quality of teaching basic skills. Special Education programs also must continue to meet the needs of handicapped youngsters.

"On the national scene, you will see greater use of microcomputers in schools. The combination of video cassettes, television, and low-priced computers will offer dramatic new possibilities for information and problemsolving for all students.

"We already have started pilot programs here for micro-computers in elementary and high school.'



Here's how Fermi II will generate power

The power is in *your* hands, Detroit Edison tells us. And so it is.

Without it, we would be unable to have toast and coffee for breakfast, run the vacuum cleaner, warm our homes, cool our food or light our way.

The power that it take to do those things is called electricity, a power that must be generated or made. But it takes fuel to heat water, turning it into steam to turn the turbines that generate electricity.

While researchers look for new forms of fuel or energy, Detroit Edison is building a nuclear power plant within 50 miles of most Wayne County communities. Edison officials say that by spring 1982, the Fermi II nuclear plant will begin offering 1.1 million kilowatts of power.

Basically, Fermi II is a steam generating plant that uses nuclear energy as fuel. Generating steam, however, will be a lot more complicated at this plant than just flicking a switch somewhere.

LETS TAKE a look at how Fermi II rill operate.

Like the reactor at the Three Mile Island, Pa. plant, Fermi's reactor is known as a light water reactor. Ordinary water contains hydrogen and oxygen, and light water simply contains a light isotope or form of hydrogen.

Water is used at both plants as a coolant and is heated to steam to drive turbines. That's about all the two reactors have in common in the generating pro-

Three Mile Island unit is called a pressurized water reactor. Water in that unit goes to a steam generator before going to turbines.

Fermi uses a boiling water reactor. Water is heated by the process of nuclear fission. Pission occurs when a neutron is released by the nuclear fuel. The Fermi plant uses Uranium 235 as fuel. Those neutrons hit other atoms of Uranium, dividing them and releasing more neutrons.

Besides neutrons, the fission process also releases large amounts of heat, which warms the water, eventually turning it into steam. This radioactive steam travels through pipes to turn the turbine generators. After reaching the turbines, the steam is cooled by a separate loop of pipe called a condenser which contains water.

IN AN exchange of heat, water in the condenser is warmed as the steam

returns to its liquid state as water. The radioactive water is pumped back into the reactor, while water in the condenser flows to the cooling towers. At the towers, water flows over slats along the walls as it is cooled by the natural upward draft of the towers.

In case of a malfunction in any step of the process, the Fermi plant has nine backup systems to prevent a nuclear accident.


It will take 18 months to load fuel into Fermi's nuclear reactor. Every 12 months after that the reactor will have to be refueled. That's a process that takes nine weeks, according to plant superintendent Bill White.

Fuel comes in the form of 15-foot rods. The rods are loaded when the reactor vessel is full of water and the control rods are in place. The control rods prevent fission from occuring. There are 185 of them, one for each

The fuel and control rods form a core in the reactor that is 17 feet in diameter.

The Fermi site contains enough space to store 13 years worth of used fuel rods. Permanent dumpign sites are still unavailable.

"There's no one with the guts to make a decision about what to do with nuclear wastes," said White. He added that Sweden, Britain and France have a system for reprocessing the waste so it can be reused.

DURING THE refueling process, fuel rods are kept under water. They are moved by an operator with computer-controlled cranes through gates in the reactor vessel to an adjacent fuel pool. Water is purified to avoid contaminating the fuel, and the pool is constantly air swept to detect any sign of ical fans to cool water for a maximum radiation.

Two backup systems include the residual heat building and the torus.

A round, doughnut-shaped tube, the torus is 31 feet in diameter and 165 feet in circumference. The torus is kept half-filled with water. If there is any rupture in the reactor in the coolant system, the water or steam would be diverted into the torus to reduce pressure in the reactor's housing or contain-

The residual heat building has four cooling towers of its own with mechanof 30 days.

The tunnels in which the steam pipes are enclosed resemble a labyrinth. This helps prevent the spread of radioactivity, which can't travel around corners, according to White.

The circular control room looks like a movie set. That's where the action will be once the reactor begins operating. It includes the main panel with a mock up of the core. Dials, gauges, buttons, levers and switches operate the three computers used in the plant. There are two "scram" buttons for ex-

treme emergencies, and 1,200 alarms for assorted situations.

But there "isn't much room for operator error," says White

Computers monitor operators. Usually there are two operators, one for the reactor itself and a second for the backup systems. A shift supervisor keeps watch from an adjacent techni-

cal support room. Why spend more than \$1 billion for a power plant?

"We feel the company has a responsibility to provide electricity on a local level," said Saul Waldman, Edison public affairs manager





Scallops and Flounder... Great Grill Mates

The old whaling port of New Bedford, Mass., closed the books on whaling many years ago and got down to the business of hunting prime food fish instead. New Bedford vessels became known for the the plump, succulent sea scallops they brought ashore and the delicious, firmfleshed flounder and sole they harvested in the cold depths of the Georges Bank

Scallops are the tender muscle of the large sea scallop. They are tender and sweet enough to eat raw, and frequently are as they are shucked. Flounder and sole are members of the flatfish family. The meat is white, tender yet firm.



A roast of beef with the potatoes, carrots and whole onions cooked to perfection in the roasting pan with the meat is one of my favorites. As we were blissfully savoring every bite, our hostess, Dot Julien,

asked, "Have you ever cooked spare ribs with lima beans?"

She produced her recipe file and before we were through, I had copied three recipes.

SPARE RIBS WITH LIMA BEANS

Wash one cup dried lima beans. Soak in water overnight or for four or five hours. Drain. Put in casserole.

Dissolve one rounded teaspoon brown sugar, one-eighth teaspoon mustard, salt and pepper in one cup boiling water. Pour this over the lima

Arrange 11/2 pounds spare ribs over the beans and bake in slow oven (300 degrees) for three or four hours. Dot says she baked them covered.

1 tsp. vanilla

2 cups dates, cut in small pieces

8 oz. candied cherries, cut in small pieces

CALIFORNIA COOKIES

SKEWERED SCALLOPS AND BACON

I pound sea scallops, fresh or

frozen, defrosted

1/4 cup honey

1/4 cup soy sauce

8 slices bacon

1/4 cup lemon juice

4 cherry tomatoes or tomato wedges

Remove any shell pieces from scallops and rinse well. Drain. Combine honey with soy sauce and lemon juice. Put scallops in a flat pan and pour honey mixture over. Refrigerate from 30 minutes to 2 hours. Drain off sauce and reserve. Meanwhile, cook bacon slices over moderate heat about 4 minutes

Put scallops on skewers, stringing bacon between and around scallops. Top skewers with tomato. Grill about 3 inches from heat for 5 to 7 minutes, basting with sauce and turning to brown all sides. Makes 4 servings.





GRILLED STUFFED FLOUNDER FILLETS

2 pounds fresh flounder fillets

1/4 cup finely chopped onion 2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 slice white or whole wheat bread 2 tablespoons brandy

I tablespoon chopped fresh basil or

1 teaspoon dried basil

2 or 3 sprigs fresh thyme or

1/8 teaspoon ground thyme

1/2 teaspoon salt

Sort out the largest fillets (about 8 inches long) and if there are not 4, combine smaller pieces to make four 8-inch long fillets about 4 inches wide. They can be held together with a small skewer or toothpicks. Place flat on a sheet of wax paper or fish wrapping. Trim off end pieces to "square" fillets. There should be at least 1/2 cup of end pieces, but

Sauté onion in oil until tender but not browned. Add fish pieces left from arranging the fillets and cook several minutes until fish can be flaked. Crumble bread into skillet. Add brandy and seasonings, and stir until well blended. Spoon about 2 tablespoons down the center of each fillet. Cut Swiss cheese slices in half lengthwise and place on filling. Roll fillets, starting at narrow end. If cheese wants to peek out, bend slice back so it is covered by fish. Place stuffed fillets in an oiled fish grill. Spread fillets with softened butter. Grill about 3 inches from heat about 15 minutes, turning to cook both sides. Remove any skewers and serve with sautéed zucchini. Makes 4 servings.



Don't be intimidated in your choice of wines

Wine devotees and history buffs may be interested to learn that wine was being produced and enjoyed in the valleys of the Nile and Mesopotamia as far back as 2700 B.C.

However, one need not travel quite that far for a delicious sip of the grape. In fact area markets and wine stores offer a chance to explore the many fine

wines available in their own backyard. And with new development and technology, Michigan wines are finally coming into their own.

More and more Americans are learning what Europeans have known for centuries: the pleasures of wine drinking and cookery.

However, along with our recently developed wine palates has evolved a group of so-called wine connoisseurs and gourmets who have attached a snobbish ritual to wine drinking. Many people feel so patronized by these socalled authorities that rather than make an incorrect wine choice, they have avoided making any choice at all.

And what a shame that is. For there are really no hard and fast rules in wine drinking and cooking. The only thing that is important is whether or not a particular wine pleases you.

FRANKLY, the time has come to dispel the mystique that wines and haughtiness are synonymous and to lay to rest the misconception that the only fine wines are imported from Europe.

In the past very little has been said or written about Michigan wines. Until recently there really was very little that could be said for them. However, there is now a very good future for the wines of our state. The climate, resources and potential are all available to produce fine wines and more and more of them will be making their appearances at local stores.

Whatever you do, do not allow yourself to be intimidated in your wine choice by pseudo-sophisticates who profess to know all there is to know



Recipes scaled for twosomes or singles

Preparing meals for one or two people requires some calculating since most re-

So for all of us who eat by ones and twos, always or occasionally, here are some dishes scaled to fit.

SAVORY VEAL CUTLET

(Serves one)

1 medium-size onion, sliced

2 tbsp. butter I veal cutlet, about 1-inch thick

Flour for dredging

13 tsp. salt 1/3 tsp. paprika

14 cup sour cream

Saute the onions in the butter until golden. Coat the veal cutlet with the flour, add to the pan and saute on both sides.

Season the meat with the salt and paprika. Stir in the sour cream, cover and cook over very low heat until veal is tender. Do not allow mixture to boil.

BAKED PICKEREL

(Serves one)

14 to 12 pound pickerel fillets Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

2 tbs. butter

2 tbs. finely chopped onion'

14 lb. mushrooms, sliced

1 tbsp. chopped parsley I large tomato, peeled, seeded and chopped

34 cup buttered soft bread crumbs

1 thsp. grated sharp cheddar cheese

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place the fillets in a well-greased shallow baking dish and season with salt and pepper. Melt the butter in a skillet and saute the onion in it until tender. Add the mushrooms and cook until moisture evaporates.

Add the parsley and tomatoes. Season with salt and pepper. Pour over the fish. Top with the bread crumbs mixed with the cheese. Bake 30 minutes, or until fish flakes easily

MUSHROOM STEW

(Serves one) 14 onion, finely chopped

2 tbsp. butter 12 lb. mushrooms, sliced

11 tsp. salt 18 tsp. freshly ground black

pepper

14 cup milk

1 tsp. flour, plus 12 tsp. more, if needed 1 tsp. freshly snipped dill weed, or 12 tsp. dried dill

112 tsp. chopped parsley

14 cup plus 2 tbsp. buttermilk

Saute the onion in the butter in a heavy skillet. Add the mushrooms, salt and pepper and saute five minutes. Mix the milk with the flour and add with the dill and parsley. Simmer 10 minutes.







Louise Snider

'Cuba' stays cool despite theme of high adventure

Melodramas seem to have gone out of fashion, yet their contents are literally the stuff that movies are made of - action, romance, adventure. One of the few current entries in that category is

In addition to the usual ingredients, it offers some very dry British humor, striking photography and historical perspective on

a major political event The paradox of "Cuba" is that in spite of all its excitement, it's a cool film, which perhaps accounts for the cool reception it seems

Richard Lester directed with a detachment that may be too sophisticated for an audience anticipating sex and violence with their romance and adventure. The film has these components; it simply doesn't dwell on them.

THE STORY IS set in Cuba in 1959, just as the Battista regime is toppling. Lester has the benefit of 10 years' distance, and he uses that advantage well. Neither the Castro rebels nor the regular army win any laurels. The government is corrupt, repressive and brutal. The Fidelistas terrorize and murder.

The moral (or immoral) position of both sides creates an interesting situation for the hero, Sean Connery. He plays a British officer, a specialist in counter-insurgent warfare from Malaya, hired by the army to help them quash the rebels.

Its's too late for that. Nevertheless, Connery is there. The interesting facet of his character is his steadiness. He is not radicalized and won over to the rebel cause. Neither does he apologize for the Battista regime nor for his role as a mercenary. He is paid to do a job and, he emphasizes, he does his job for "any legitimate government." He's a man of principle.

Lester, far from moralizing, has a great deal of fun with the character and situation. When Connery, the gentleman, renews a romance with an old flame, he discovers that she was only 15 when they first met, not a respectable 17, as he thought. With typical underplaying, a stifled phrase and startled expression tell us of his dicomfort at the revelation

Brooke Adams plays the long-lost love, but not very well. She is a dreadful actress. Perhaps this explains an otherwise puzzling scene in which Connery abandons her in a rebel camp.

FORTURNATELY, others in the cast compensate for such shortcomings. Chris Sarandon is handsome and convincing as Adams' philandering husband. Hector Elizondo stands out as a loyal, beleagured army officer. Jack Weston is excellent as a gross American businessman trying to make a profit out of the chaos. And Martin Balsam has fun with his role as a cunning and greedy


Most impressive of all is the atmosphere which the film catches. In an almost offhand way, impressions of an elegant dinner party, a eigar factory, an urban slum present a vivid, if casual, documentary of life in Cuba in 1959.

The warm colors, contrasts, and low-key humor make for an oddly interesting, hot/cool film.

Housewife has that certain aura

She looks like any other homemaker in her print dress and carefully sprayed coif.

There's a Victorian style dollhouse under construction in her dining room. Her living room is decorated with books and aquariums. She collects kitchen witches.

But Terry Vigone of Farmington Hills deviates from the accepted path of typical homemakers. She's a psychic who says she delves into the past, present and future of persons by following the colors or auras which surround

"I follow the color patterns until I get to something," she said, motioning as if she were pulling a kite back to earth.

"I let the colors wash over me. I become that person. Ffeel what the person feels."

Usually she holds something that belongs to the person she is studying, practicing a method called psychometry.

Unlike others who insist on maintaining an air of hocus-pocus, Ms. Vigone tires to explain how she sees, as well as what she sees, to her audience. She speaks before groups such as those assembled for classes in Do Something Different, a series featured in community centers and adult education programs in southeastern Michigan cities.

MS. VIGONE didn't grow up knowing she could see something different. She says she saw the notes in her piano lessons as colors. Certain tones produced certain colors. But she took for granted that everyone saw these things.

"I would tell my mother about the colors and she would agree with me," she said, laughing.

Her family was Roman Catholic and psychic phenomena wasn't recognized as a suitable topic for dinnertime discussion. So Ms. Vigone kept seeing colors accompanying sounds, voices and persons without thinking much of it until 10 years ago when she began reading the works of Edgar Cayce.

"I was delighted. There isn't anything I'm more interested in now than psychic phenomena.

Her interest in the field doesn't conflict with her religious beliefs, she says.

"People ask me in classes if I believe in God. They still think this is somehow forbidden. 'But it's not. It should make church going more

meaningful. It should broaden your faith." In her readings she tries to give the person a "reason for being.

"I'm very careful. I don't tell them just stories. I try to be honest and truthful.'

HER OWN experience in the field started from scratch. She confesses to be amazed when she discovered what a psychic did. And although she believes in reincarnation now, she says, "I thought it went out with flying carpets and Alladin's lamp."

While under hypnosis, she experienced a previous life. In that other life she was a 13-year-old Quaker girl in Indiana. Her father was a strict man and she was afraid of him. One night she ran away and hid in the trees.

Under hypnosis, Mrs. Vigone said she saw the country cabin catch on fire and she felt the heat of the flames as she saw herself as the little girl hid-

"I knew my grandmother and baby brother were in the house. I knew they would die in the fire. I felt

She accepts the event as part of a past life because she suffered from nightmares about a fire when she was a little girl. She would dream that there was fire in the trees which was on its way to destroying the world.

Fear of fire persisted into adulthood.

After the experience under hypnosis, she says her adult fears of her home burning in the night were not as strong.

HELPING CONQUER fear is one aspect of her readings. A young woman is told that an auto accident which caused her mother's death isn't her fault. She wasn't in the car at the time. She had let her mother drive her car. The woman leaves com-

Another is told that there are bunny rabbits in her surrounding aura of color. That means she will have children, according to Ms. Vigone

Another woman is told that she knows someone who collects guns. She doesn't. Several months later, she meets and falls in love with a gun collector.

PARADISE ISLAND, Bahamas — Here I stand with \$5 worth of American quarters clutched in my hot little hands. On every side I hear two statements repeated: "You know you can never beat the house" and "Let's go win some money."

The James Bond movie "Thunderball" partly was filmed across the street in the Cate Martinique, just this side of the toll bridge that leads to the city of Nassau. Bond's doubles can be seen clothed in their impeccable black and white evening best dealing chips at every gambling table in the casino.

They sit on the platform high over the baccarat table where the people who gamble real money are watched from behind a brass rail by people who like to watch people who gamble real money. He is over there beside the wheel of fortune and he is the croupier at that first roulette table.

From the top of the stairs leading to the casino, you see a mass of people fixed in the lights shining from the slot machines banked left and right. The dust cones of ceiling lights shine on heads leaning bald and gray, blonde and black over the gaming tables.

GAMBLING IS SUPPOSED to be fun, but the crowd looks very serious about this entertainment. If you ask anybody what is going on, you'll probably get a short, very short, reply.

It you read the little souvenir guide, you won't need to ask why all those quarters are piling up on the crap table when everybody obviously is playing with chips.

The correct odds on certain numbers are against the house, so you must pay 5 percent commission to bet on those numbers. Twenty-

I thought to ask if the house would pay me the 5 percent when the odds were against the customer, but one look at the serious faces of formally attired croupiers and I changed my mind. This may be fun but it's no joking matter.

1 WATCHED A MAN at the black jack table play three hands at once with \$100 chips. I watched men and women from places like Southfield and Peoria feed chips into the croupier's pile like a kid feeding peanuts to the monkeys, and then I scuttled away to the slot machines, my quarters still clutched in my hand.


I know. I know. James Bond would be ashamed of me. Playing the slot machines seems innocent enough but those green tables scare the bell out of me.


Croupier David Ruffell understands us cowards. "Lots of people feel safe with the fruit machines, but they think they're really gambling when they play the tables." Yes, sir.

Andros, Bahamas An unmarred crescent of sand

An unmarred crescent of sand for miles in either direction

By IRIS SANDERSON JONES

SOUTH ANDROS, Bahamas — I am sunning on an island that is stitched with sand and palm trees to the turquoise waters of the south Atlantic.

South Andros is only half an hour's flight from the cruise ships and casinos of Nassau, but from where I sit, it must look as it did when pirates and explorers were here centuries ago.

Ahead of me, through the palm trees, the sea runs away without anything making a mast for a skyline — clear blue-green and then dark blue under a powder-blue-and-

white cloud-puffed sky.

Turning my head I see a tiny sailboat rounding the far point of the
island and another, larger, sailboat
pulled up on the beach. Otherwise
the beach is an unmarred crescent
of sand for miles in either direction.

Behind me, a newly painted white motel and dining room surround a swimming pool that seems superfluous in this setting. It's all fringed over with high palms like a picture postcard, and blown with a cool January breeze. Bahamians wear long sleeves and sweaters on a 70-degree day like this, but mainlanders sun-

Out to sea, there is supposed to be a reef second only to the Australian barrier reef, but I am too busy lying on the beach staring at a huge conch shell to explore. Most of the time, travel is an exhausting business. Now that I have found a real lazing-around place, I plan to enjoy it.

ANDROS ISLAND is the biggest of the Bahama Islands. On the map it is a large green shape divided into cays, or separate interior portions, sectional like the body of a caterpiller.

Tourists apparently are familiar with North Andros. The island has the resort facilities to accommodate them. South Andros sees very few travelers, so you practically have the island to yourself. A vacation there is like visiting a friend, perhaps not a rich friend but one who lives in a spectacular setting and is willing to let you share what he's got.

Everything runs on Bahamas Time, which loosely means whenever. Bahamasair schedules a 30-minute flight from Nassau daily, leaving the city at 8 a.m., stopping briefly at Mangrove Cay, landing in South Andros at 8:30 a.m. and leaving for Nassau at 9 a.m. But all of that is definitely done on Bahamas time.

We arrived at the Nassau airport one hour before flight time but we needn't have hurried. The flight was delayed an hour and instead of flying the blue and gold Bahamasair plane, we climbed the aisle of a DC3 obviously charterd to replace it.

The small, stucco airport terminal at South Andros was full of local women and children ready for their regular shopping expedition to Nassau. The island does not grow enough food to support its few thousand residents, so the trips are regular and frequent.

THERE ARE TWO hotels on the

rary board and stone motel that meets the standards of a good road-side motel in the United States. It costs about \$17.50 a night per person on the beach side for a large room with two beds and a fully equipped bathroom.

The dining room, wih its corner bar, serves meals at regular hours. The local fish and lobster is fine. The fruit and vegetables are often canned and the coffee is powdered, because everything must be imported here.

A smaller, older hotel called the Congo Beach Hotel, about a mile down the beach, charges about \$10 a person per night for a room and a bathroom down the hall (\$20 per person including breakfast and dinner). There is no running hot water there but the staff will gladly fill a tub for you. The owners, Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Davis, are said to be good hosts and to serve one of the better dinner tables on the island.

But all of these are statistics and a visit to South Andros is a people experience. The island is about 45 miles wide and 104 miles long, with tiny fishing villages around its edges. The road starts at Driggs Hill to the north, where Captain Johnson's 360-horsepower boat takes cargo and passengers regularly on the six-hour trip across open water to Nassau for about \$14 one-way.

THE ROAD SOUTH, runs past Congo Town, near the airport, and Kemp's Bay, where comes in once a week to Mars Bay

on the other end of the island. Brightly painted pink and green and blue buildings are scattered among the small houses and the endless number of small bars.

The largest settlement is at High Rock, where a pink elementary school sits high and cool on a hill of coral rock. One of the island's famous "blue holes" is downhill behind the school.

A blue hole, apparently, is a bottomless small lake that rises and lowers with the tide, with the water from the sea flowing through some deep unknown hole into coral reef.

Tuesday morning, when the mailboat arrives from Nassau, everyone gathers dockside at Kemp's Bay. Four white-robed Catholic nuns from a local school make white patches among the colorful clothes of local people, all of them waiting for the supplies they ordered.

If you are beginning to yawn by now, this is not the vacation for you. You can take a small boat out to fish or play on the sea, scuba dive or even do some deep-sea diving off the island, but you probably won't find a local guide to show you where to dive unless you look pretty hard.

The conch shells that cost good money in Nassau or the U.S. are scattered on the beach, usually chipped but still lovely, along with sand dollars and other small treasures.

Porsche, long known for its passenger and sports cars, will enter the Indianapolis 500 this year.

Its entry is powered by a turbo-charged version of a production powerplant. The engine is similar to the one that has powered the winning car at Le Mans for three of the past four years.

The chassis is being developed by Porsche and Interscope, a California-based racing team.

The 33 alcohol-powered cars that will make up the field for the 500 are expected to reach speeds of more than 190 mph. The Indy 500 is considered to be the single biggest sports event in the world, with nearly \$1.3 million in prize money and an estimated single-day attendance of more than 375,000 peo-

Do 'mixed blessings' lie ahead? Michigan's economy: Indicator of national growth

By THEORDORE FERRIS

Ferris works for the Michigan Senate Fiscal Agency. Here's his outlook for the year titled "The Economic and Budget Outlook for the State of Michigan: Prospects for Growth in the 1980s." The report was presented to the U of M Economic Outlook Confer-

Just as the U.S. economy has exhibited an uneven growth path as of late, the growth of the Michigan economy has been markedly more jagged.

Depending upon the industrial make-up of a particular state, a period of pronounced economic expansion or an economic recession can have profoundly different impacts nationwide.

As is well documented, recessions tend to postpone and in some cases, eliminate business and consumer spending on "big time" items. Consumer expenditures on durable goods and business fixed investment are the first items to be lopped from budgets in a deteriorating economy.

Thus, states such as Michigan, with an emphasis on durable goods manufacturing are characterized by a "feast or famine" economy.

Predictably, the states hit hardest by national recessions are in an industrial belt consisting of the Great Lake states, the Northeast and the Mid-At-

lantic states Not only do these states have a preponderance of basic manufacturing activity, they are characterized by older, less-efficient plant and equipment as industrial expansion is increasingly concentrated in western and southern

Consequently, Michigan is an oftnoted casualty in a recession, and a severe recession such as 1973-75 can lead to "depression-like" developments for this state.

ALL OF THESE prefacatory remarks on the relation between the national business cycle and the Michigan economy are by way of saying that the most beneficial factor for the health of the Michigan economy in the next decade will be the relative health and stability of the U.S. economy.

No single other aspect can outweight the importance of sustained real growth, since to a large measure, sustainable and significant real growth can not take place without Michigan partaking of its fruits.

To dramatize this point, consider the wide difference in real economic growth we experienced in the past two decades.

The 60s were marked by an unprecedented 105 month expansion from 1961 to 1969 while the 70s, as previously noted, will have witnessed three recessions for Michigan, including the most severe economic downturn in nearly half a century.


The significance for Michigan of this variance in national growth is well summarized by data for average real weekly earnings in manufacturing, real wages and salaries, and wage and salary employment.

The lack of significant real growth in the '70s also impacted heavily on the characteristics of wage and salary employment in Michigan.

During the '60s, shares of employment by borad industrial classification remained relatively constant.

Over the last decade, however, major shifts have taken place. Manufacturing employment's share of the total has fallen a whopping 8 percent, while transportation, communications and utilities have come to comprise four percent less of the total.

Retail and wholesale trade, on the other hand, represent two percent more of the total, government 4 percent and services 6 percent. This

in distributive and tertiary industries is expected to continue.

THE SCENARIO of national economic development which, I previously outlined is consistent with a much im-

trend toward increased employment proved Michigan economy in the 1980s. The presence of three Michigan recessions in the 1970s has severly limited real economic gains in

> As noted, by most any broad-based economic yardsticks workers in the

Michigan economy are barely better off in 1979 than they were in 1973, or in many cases, 1969.

The presence in the 1980s, however, of declining and not accelerating inflation rates, of a business fixed investment "boom," and of a surge in household formations by consumers who are in their prime acquisition stage of life, bodes well for this state's economy and its workers.

There are other ingredients which may further impact favorably on our economy.

First, in order to comply with federa mandates and to meet consumer demands for more fuel efficient stock o motor vehicles, the auto manufacturers and their subsidiaries will be investing some \$100 billion in plant equipment and research in 1980-84.

Despite the presence of any "sunbelt strategy" which may be advanced over this period, Michigan stands to garner a major piece of this investment, as one-third of all motor vehicle production takes place in Michigan.

Ironically, I expect that the federa: mandates will causes more investment to take place in Michigan than would have otherwise occurred if a sunbelt strategy does indeed exist.

In effect, the feds have forced the manufacturerrs to make investment plans and expenditures earlier than they ordinarily would have, which often makes retooling and rehabilitation of existing facilities in Michigan more economically wise than new construction elsewhere.

In lieu of the mandates, the manufacturers may have chosen to phase out certain Michigan facilities over the remainder of the century. Investment in Michigan by auto manufacturers is also enhanced by the favorable treatment of capital outlays under Michigan's Single Business Tax as well as the high percentage of property tax abatement under Public Act 198 of

1974 which is accruing to auto companies.

SECOND, CONSTRUCTION activity may show even greater strength if the past weakness in several sectors is reversed. There are signs of an impending upsurge in multi-family units. commercial buildings and public

Third, due to the high technological requirements and the heavy machinery involved, Michigan stands to share in the benefits offered by the development of alternative energy sources.


Our efforts to secure the Solar Energy Research Institute (formerly located in Colorado) recently established by Congress convinced us that Michigan has much to offer and gain from this and other alternative energy developments.


Fourth, higher transportation costs will combine with Michigan's unique geographical location within Great Lakes to ensure that Michigan's tourism industry will be among the most rapidly growing sectors of our econo-

Manufacturing and agriculture rank first and second. It is conceivable that tourism will overtake agriculture in the number two spot in the 80s.

High transportation costs will cause travelers to take vacations closer to home. Michigan's northern country. and our abundance of fresh water in the face of severe shortages in the fast growing southwest, should combine to make the two peninsulas increasingly attractive. The significance of our access to unlimited fresh water and its significance for industrial as well as commerical and residential growth should not be underestimated.

Nevertheless, they are in my judgement a reasonable approximation of the type of growth we will experience in the next decade - a little less inflation, slightly more real growth and further diversifications of our economy







Aggressive retailing key to 1980, retailer says

By THEODORE A. BINTZ JR.

The following remarks are the text of a speech given by Bintz at the Detroit Economic Club's Economic Forecast Luncheon.

1980 will certainly be a challenge, if not a hurdle, for the retail industry in Detroit. The uncertainty that was so much a part of the 1979 scenario will continue to plague Detroit area retailers in the coming year

Inflation will definitely task Detroit business.

Even if stores in the Detroit area experience an actual increase in sales dollars in 1980, the number of transactions will continue to slide, in tandem with the economics of our Motor City eco-

Although we are anticipating a slow-down in the Detroit retail world for 1980, there are some

1. The memory of the last recession in 1974-75 has caused retailers to be more cautious in their planning for 1980. Retailers in recent years have become more prepared to make changes with a keen sense of urgency and innovation.

2. Inventories are being monitored by retailers more closely, to prevent sluggish stocks from backing up the pipeline.

3. Many stores today have installed electronic point-of-sale equipment to track sales and accounts receivable with improved accuracy. This electronic revolution is most significant because retailing is comprised of day-to-day figures.

4. A plus for existing Detroit retailers is that the expansion of selling space will be relatively modest in 1980 in contrast to prior years. What this means is that the existing retail managements can concentrate on intensifying the productivity of

5. Retailers are also the indirect beneficiaries of the fact that there has been major declines in the discretionary dollars channeled to the recreational vehicle sphere. In recent years, boats, campers, snow mobiles and the like had been competing for the same consumer dollars as

stores pursue. And now, what are the current economic indicators predicting for the next 12 months? Our Hudson economists forecast that the slow-down of 1980 will not be as bleak as the recession of 1974-75, although retailers will be under tremendous pressures throughout the beginning of the

For some, it will be a year of challenge. For others, it will be a year of crisises.

Retailers who can accept change as a reality as well as an opportunity will discipline themselves and their organization to securing more market share of the existing dollars available. 1980 is going to be the year of the active merchant. 1980 is going to be the year for innovation in all aspects of running a store.

WHY I'M ADVOCATING a well-conceived creativity premised upon the fact that retailing is "fashion" and "fashion is change," whether it be soft or hard goods.

Let's talk about some of these changes.

1. No market today reigns as the only influence on what is "in" and what is "out." Paris, Milan, New York and California - plus a host of other creative centers - offer a choice for all merchandise. The astute merchant will need to be even more skilled on when to move things in and when to get on to the next trend.

2. Consumers in 1980 will be less likely to replenish their closets and homes with "old standbys." Rather, demand will have to be created by the retail industry for new-styled "I can't live without it" merchandise.

3. In the technological arena, creative retailers

will find new ways to streamline variable costs of doing business. For example, utilizing computers to marshall heat-light-air-conditioning can make a significant overall reduction in energy usage and potential expense. Continued advancements in point-of-purchase equipment and the integration of more sophisticated back-office systems can alleviate the tremendous strain and expense of manhours traditionally required to move our in-

'Evidence of boom all around us'

The following remarks were made during a speech given by Aliber at the Detroit Economic Club's Economic Forecast Luncheon.

My assignment today is to discuss what is currently going on in the housing and mortgage markets, and what is likely to be happening in the next 6-12 months.

It is certainly no news to this audience that there has been a tremendous boom in housing during the last few years. Ever since the recession period of 1973-1974 ended, housing has generated one set of great growth statistics after the

Evidence of this boom has been all around us. In our own community we see it as we drive around the outlying suburbs of Farmington, Sterling Heights, Troy and Canton Township, to name just a few. And within walking distance of this building, new single-family dwellings, conventionally financed, have been selling at a brisk pace.

Not only has there been a boom in numbers of housing starts and sales, but also in values. Are there any of us that haven't been amazed at the prices placed on the homes we live in, or the price of housing when we've been in the market? Just for a moment, I'd like to preview some of

the key indicators which reflect the performance of this segment of the economy. The total number of sales of existing single-family houses in 1978 was 3.9 million, and through August of this year, the annual rate was the same. This represents a 144 percent increase in the sales of existing units over those sold in 1970. THE DOLLAR value of these sales in 1978 was

\$217 billion, and in 1979 through August the annual pace of sales was running at \$255 billion. To put this gigantic figure into perspective, you should recognize that the total amount of corporate debt in public hands amounts to about \$260 billion. In 1970, total existing home sales were just over \$41 billion, therefore the 1979 sales level is 522 percent over the 1970 volume.

During the 1970s, the average sales price of existing single-family homes has gone from \$25,700 to \$66,300, a 160 percent increase. The American home has turned out, for most families, to be the best investment they have ever made.

Recognition of this phenomenon has encouraged more people into the housing market at a younger age. And for those who already owned a home, the increased equity generated by the increased value could be leveraged into a bigger and more expensive home.

This growth in volume and value would not have occurred as readily if it had not been for a very accommodating and ample mortgage market During the last four years when the biggest part of this growth was taking place, interest rates were relatively stable, funds in good supply and mortgage terms were very attractive.

In 1976 and 1977, the ayerage interest rate, including fees and charges, on existing and new homes averaged 9 percent. In 1978, the average rate increased about one-half of 1 percent and continued to climb gradually until it reached 11

percent last September. THE BORROWER'S WILLINGNESS to take on debt during the latter stages of this period, at interest rates in excess of 10 percent or more, seemed to be the result of inflationary expectations. If the rate of inflation was close to or exceeded long-term debt rates, there wasn't much penalty in borrowing at these levels. Besides, with home values going up so fast, the return on the investment was still very attractive, and if one waited, the thinking went, the price of the home

Consequently, American families went on a home-buying binge that lasted four years.

On Saturday night, October 6 of this year, the great housing boom of 1976-1979 came to an abrupt end. Led by Chairman Volcker, the Fed's action caused interest rates to increase quickly to levels that have discouraged mortgage borrowing, and caused the postponement of home-purchasing decisions.

The higher level of interest rates has also slowed the rate of savings growth at savings and loan associations. Savings deposits are the backbone of mortgage credit. During the 1976-79 period, new savings increases nationally averaged over \$45 billion per year at savings and loan associations. That growth, together with loan repayments and loan sales, made it possible for savings and loans to have record lending years.

Since October, the rates on Money Market Funds, T-Bills and municipal bonds have become more attractive than most of the accounts offered by banks and savings and loans, causing savings flows to dry up. Mortgage lenders had no option except to push up the lending rates and to make lending terms less attractive in order to ration available mortgage credit.


Conventional mortgage rates climbed to a national average of about 14 percent. As a result, applications for home loans at these rates dropped to the lowest level in years.

There are two reasons for this: First, many prospective buyers cannot qualify to meet the higher monthly payments caused by the higher interest rates; and second, many of those who could qualify seem to be deciding to wait for mortgage rates to come down.

Those families who have to buy because of job transfers or another immediate need for housing have turned to loan assumptions and land contracts to avoid the high conventional loan rate.

Unfortunately, however, these financing methods by themselves cannot be expected to keep the housing market healthy. The results are already showing up in lower sales of existing homes, a reduction in new housing starts, and for the first time since the recessionary period of the mid-70s, an actual reduction in the price and value of homes.

There's plenty of choices

High interest rates plus inflation equals sluggish home market

By JOHN HALSER

Halser's remarks concerning "What Can Area Home Buyers and Sellers Expect in 1980" were presented recently at the Detroit Press Club.

I'd like to review with you briefly our views on the 1980 residential real estate market. But in order to see where we are going, let's take a look at where we were a year ago and what has happened since.

We entered 1979 on a very high note after three record years of home buying. Average home prices climbed about 14 percent during 1978 to reach a level just over \$47,000.

Listings, that had been in short supply through the year, were beginning to increase in number in most areas. Interest rates on the typical 20 percent downpayment, 30-year convential mortgage had risen to 10.5 percent.

This interest rate seemed high at that time but passing the alleged barrier of 10 percent was proving to be no deterrant to buyer interest.

Last year, I think we may have shocked some of you by stating that interest rates would top 12 percent during 1979. We also said that this increase would begin to retard home sales, but would make more listings available and slow the pace of increasing prices. This is exactly what has happened during the year.

January was our last month of sales gain over the previous year. In the first three quarters, average price gains slowed to a 9.3 percent rate with sales off about 10 percent from the same 1978 period.

LISTINGS BEGAN to increase and even some of the better homes began to remain on the market longer as interest rates climbed to 11.5 percent in mid-year.

As these rates continued to edge up in the third quarter, buyer resistance increased although average prices took a slight downward trend.

However, it is in this final quarter tht we are experiencing the pattern that we see continuing well into 1980. The

typical interest rate being offered buyers on a conventional 20 percent downpayment mortgage is about 13.5 percent. Which means that within the year, this rate has climbed three full percentage points from the seemingly high 10.5 at the year's beginning.

What does this mean for the typical home buyer who must be concerned about what share of take-home pay can be allocated for housing payments? Monthly payment of principal and interest on a \$50,000 home with a 20 percent down payment mortgage would have been \$365.90 in January. Now it is \$457 or \$91.10 more.

Even with this high rate of interest, mortgage funds have tightened up considerably. Many depositors are shifting their savings into both short-and long-term documents that offer a high yield. Many lenders have dropped out of the market, reduced this portion of their business, or become increasingly cautious about qualifying buyers.

With these factors, our board will end the year showing about a 16 percent drop in sales from 1978 and a 15 percent increase in listings.

DURING THE first 11 months of 1978, the average price for a home through our territory was about \$44,100. In the same period in 1979, this average price had climbed to about \$53,100 or by about 20 percent

This figure is somewhat distorted by an increased number of higher-priced homes in the market which pushed the average up. The median price would be several thousand dollars lower. With present market conditions, we anticipate the average for

homes sold by our members in December will be close to \$52,000 which compared to the \$47,700 average last December or a 9 percent gain.

Considering the increased prices and the drop in sales, total dollar volume for homes sold by our members in 1979 should be close to last year at \$817 million.

A significant change we have noted in recent months is the increased number of home-buys being accomplished with other than conventional mortgage financing. In November, for example, the percentage of conventional mortgages in sales by our members dropped to 24.3 percent from the 64.7 percent of a year earlier.

For the same period, mortgage assumptions climbed from 18.8 percent to 28.3 percent, land contracts were up to 28.5 percent from 6.7 percent, and VA mortgages used reached 10.1 percent from 2.8 percent.

As we move into the new decade of the '80s, there are those who proclaim the bottom is dropping out of the real estate market. We strongly disagree. Anyone who follows the real estate market knows that it is somewhat cyclical. The present downturn is not unusual in this historical view.





Will '80 be a record construction year?

By WILLIAM E. KORTE

The following remarks are extracted from a speech given by Korte at the Detroit Economic Club's Economic Forecast Luncheon.

In January of this year, in the economic report of the president, he was quoted as saying "the outlook for 1979 is uncertain, the prospects for 1980 are much more so, and the the probable cause of later developments can be forseen only dimly.

Hopefully, I will be somewhat more committal in my attempt at forecasting construction activity in 1980.

The construction industry in the metropolitan Detroit area has prospered for the past two years. Many contractors have reached record dollar volumes of work and, once again, all building trades unions report nearly 100 percent employ-

Spiraling inflation has had the effect of distorting the actual volume of construction work put in place and the residential construction sector appears to be seriously threatened. This situation is of grave concern to the overall construction industry.

Inflation must be brought under tighter control and the housing industry stabilized if the construction industry is to experience another record year

As we enter 1980, I would like to share with you some of the events that. will take place during the year which will shape our industry's economic picture - and my opinions as to the strengths and weaknesses of various categories of construction.

One of the more important events in 1980 will be wage negotiations. Most of the building trades' contracts will be up for renegotiation in mid-year. Both management and labor have begun laying the groundwork and developing their strategies for these wage

new element to our negotiations may be introduced by labor — that being a demand for cost-of-living adjustment, or a COLA provision, which could cause difficult negotiating problems and pose a serious roadblock to settlement.

COLA is totally inappropriate and unworkable in the construction industry - due principally to the time required to complete many construction projects - two, three, four years, and the inability to estimate with any accuracy projected wage adjustments during this time frame.

We are, however, encouraged by the fact that many of the international presidents of the various building trades unions have expressed their opposition to COLA.

In another area of the 1980 wage talks, we will be fighting to widen and encourage the acceptability of the

concept that was pioneered here in Detroit - a concept that injects stability when so many individual building trades union contracts expire within the same time period.

FURTHER, WE CANNOT overlook the present crisis of the Chrysler Corp. - its success or failure will have a profound impact on the local industrial construction scene.

Additionally, we cannot forget that 1980 is a major election year and the administration will be doing all that it can to assure that the housing industry doesn't suffer further losses and that tax breaks are available for capital expansion.


The administration's policy-makers are already looking at a 1974 law that authorizes \$10 billion to stimulate housing construction. This money, however, has yet to be appropriated.

Let's get specific and take a closer look at the following five categories of construction of construction and review each one in terms of local activity. The categories are commercial, industrial, public works, institutional and residential.


The 1980 outlook for commercial construction is one of the bright spots on the horizon. More and more local units of government and owners are utilizing Michigan's Public Act 255, which creates significant tax incentives for the revitalization of commercial areas.

Commercial office space is in greater demand and there are promising signs that this sector will see some healthy gains in the Detroit area dur-

It appears that substantial activity is developing in the office-hotel-motel and commercial construction sector. The first indications of this increased activity are the two new office towers at Ren-Cen; the proposed office-hotel complex across Jefferson; the proposed Woodward Avenue Mall. Similar projects are also planned in outlying areas such as Pontiac Township where four major hotel-motel projects are contemplated.

Survey reveals pessimism at record levels

Consumers expect finances to worsen

By RICHARD CURTIN

The following is a study on consumer pessimism and how it's hitting record levels entering the '80s. The study was presented to the University of Michigan Economic and Social Outlook Conference. Curtain explores consumer confidence for the U of M Social Science Research Institute.

Representative sample surveys of American households conducted during 1979 have documented a sustained downturn in consumer senti-

During the past two years the Index of Consumer Sentiment, a summary measure of trends in consumer attitudes and expectations, has traced a consistent path of decline.

By October 1979, the ICS stood 17 index points below the year earlier reading and 27 index points below the cyclical peak recorded two years ear-

A 62.1, the October index was just 4.1 index points above the all-time record low recorded in 1974-75. Growing awareness of a slowdown in the economy has led to sharp increases in unfavorable evaluations of business conditions and has heightened fears of spreading unemployment.

More families in the October survey rated their financial situation compared to a year ago as worse rather than better and more families expected their financial situation to worsen in the year ahead rather than improve.

In October, 46 percent of all families reported that they were worse off financially than a year earlier and 28 percent reported being better off

OCTOBER SURVEY findings reversed the entire, although small, improvement in personal financial atti-

tudes which occurred since mid-1979. Fewer respondents mentioned income increases in October 1979 (28 percent) than in October 1978 (38 percent) and more frequently mentioned higher prices making them worse off financially in October 1979 (48 percent) than in October 1978 (33

Personal financial expectations remained largely unchanged in the October survey from late summer readings. In October 1979, 28 percent of all families expected to be worse off financially in a year, while 24 percent expected to be better off financially.

Although this represents a small improvement over the early summer lows which accompanied lowered food price increases, personal financial expectations nonetheless remain near all-time record low levels.

Approximately the same proportion of families expected nominal income increases in mid-1979 as in mid-1978. The distribution of expected increases has shifted significantly and is now concentrated in the 6-9 percent

Compared with a year earlier, fewer families expected their income to increase by 10 percent or more (25 percent in August 1979, down from 31 percent in August 1978) and fewer families expected income increases in the range of 1-5 percent (12 percent in August 1979 compared with 14 percent in August 1978).

The proportion of respondents who expect income increases in the range of 6-9 percent almost tripled (6 to 17 percent). Greater concentration of

nominal income increases in the 6-9 percent range has led to lower income expectations due to the expected continuation of double-digit inflation.

In October 1979, 52 percent of all families expected prices to increase by more than their incomes during the

EVALUATIONS OF business conditions have deteriorated significantly during the past year. In October 1979, 63 percent of all respondents reported that business conditions had worsened (up from 32 percent in October 1978) while 22 percent felt business. conditions had improved compared with a year earlier (down from 45 percent in October 1978).

The major portion of this decline occurred in late 1978 and early 1979 with evaluations remaining largely unchanged at this low level during the past three months.

More than twice as many respondents in October 1979 expected the economy to worsen (35 percent) than to improve (15 percent) during 1980. This reading is significantly more pes-

simistic than October 1978 when improvement was somewhat more frequently expected than deterioration (22 versus 19 percent).

Among all families, 70 percent expected bad times financially in the economy as a whole during the next 12 months, in October 1979, up sharply from the 38 percent recorded in October 1978.

Sixty-seven percent expected periods of widespread unemployment and recession during the next five years (up from 47 percent in October 1978) while just 16 percent expected good times financially (down from 24 percent in October 1978).

The sharp declines in evaluations of business conditions during the past year have resulted from different forces. Declines occurring during the past several months have been largely due to heighteded fears of spreading unemployment. The majority of respondents (55 percent) in October 1979 expected unemployment to increase in the year ahead, compared with just 7 percent who expected dec-

THIS REPRESENTS a sharp deterioration from a year ago when just 30 percent expected unemployment to

In contrast, heightened price expectations were more closely related to earlier declines in business evaluations. In the October 1979 survey, respondents expected consumer prices to increase on average by 8.9 percent, down from the 11.4 percent alltime peak recorded in May of 1979.

In October 1979, 70 percent of all respondents expected interest rates to go up, while just 7 percent expected declines during the next year.

Throughout the past year, interest rate expectations have remained at or near all-time record levels. Recent interest rates, while not unexpected, haved lowered favorable buying atti-

To provide an assessment of the initial impact from the Federal Reserve Board's recent change in policy, the October sample was subdivided based on whether the interview was completed before or after the Oct. 6 announcement.

High interest rates had their greatest impact on attitudes toward buying conditions for cars and houses which were significantly more pessimistic following the Oct. 6 prinouncement.

In the October survey, 58 percent of all respondents favorably rated buying conditions for durable goods. down from 62 percent in October 1978. Nearly one in three respondents rated durable buying conditions as unfavorable in October 1979, up from one in four in October 1978.

The recent increase in unfavorable evaluations was partially due to more frequent complaints of high interest

Buying in advance psychology continues to be an important source of favorable durable buying attitudes. In October 1979, 48 percent reported that it was a good time to buy because prices would only go higher in the future, nearly identical to the 47 percent recorded in October 1978.



1980: A year of challenge

Shopping centers see hope

The year 1980 looms in the minds of most retailers and shopping center developers as, at best, a year of chal-

In analyzing the sales volume performance of many retail stores in the metropolitan area shopping centers for 1979, we found that retailers by and large showed "slight" sales gains

Although many retailers were bouyed by a last minute surge of Christmas sales for 1979, their overall December sales were generally slightly higher than those of 1978.

When inflation and rising leaseheld costs such as utilities, mall maintenance and real estate taxes are taken into consideration, 1979 will be classified overall as a "flat" year for shopping centers and retailing.

The prognosis for 1980? Probably more of the same. As interest rates continue to climb and consumer credit continues to increase, all retailers are faced with marketing their goods to budget-

minded consumers. The unusually high amount of

'sales" that were uncharacteristically prevalent in the 1979 Christmas season will likely continue through 1980. Is there any good news?

Yes, there is.

METROPOLITAN Detroit has always been an extremely strong market for retailing and shopping centers, There is still less shopping center space per capita in metropolitan Detroit than in many other urban markets in the United States.

Also, judging from the 1979 sales performance of such national chains as J.C. Penney, Sears, Montgomery Ward and many national chain specialty stores, metropolitan merchants did well by comparison.

Additionally, the critical gasoline situation should injure to the benefit of retailers in shopping centers because the consumer can accomplish more purchasing of goods by "onestop" shopping.

Because of high interest rates, development of new shopping centers and retail properties has been somewhat blunted, thereby reducing the risks of additional competition for existing merchants.

Notwithstanding the "challenge to survive" presented by the 1980 economic climate, demand for existing retail space in established shopping centers for the metropolitan area remains excellent.

BY WAY OF illustration, our company is handling the leasing of a new shopping center located and Five Mile and Middlebelt in Livonia called "Mid-Five Center."

Anchored by A&P, Ace Hardware and Arbor Durgs, the developers are building an additional 22,000-squarefeet of stores. All but 2,000-squarefeet of these stores were committed within a 100-day period and approximately one-half of these stores are independent merchants.

In summary, 1980 will be a challenging year for shopping center retailers, but their ability to survive is greatly enhanced by very favorable







about 1.5 million new households a year during the 1980s.

With the lose of several hundred thousand housing units each year by demolition or other causes, authorities estimate we will have to produce 2-2.4 million new units a year to keep pace with demand.

With two or three resales occuring for every new home entering the market, we see the real estate market operating at new record levels during the '80s as the economy recovers from its current dip.

One of the great concerns should be that there will not be enough new or existing homes to meet demand. We saw a decided drop in new home construction this year and predictions are that it will decline even further in 1980 — possibly as low as 1.3 million units. Thus, the growing demand and reduced construction will be two of the factors tending to push housing costs upward.

We have heard a great deal in recent years about rising prices for both new and existing homes forcing a growing number of would-be buyers out of the market. While this has not been indicated in the record home sales of the past few years, unfortunately, median home prices have been rising faster than median income.

Where it took only about 21/2 times

annual median income to pay for a home as recently as 1976, it now requires more than three year's income. And this does not take into consideration the higher interest rates now prevailing. In examining prices more closely, much of this increase can be traced to added amenities in new homes, higher land and development costs and to larger homes being built.

IN FACT, on a per square-foot basis, the cost of new home construction has closely paralleled median family income through the past 10 years. In 1968, when median income was just over \$8,600, the square-foot cost of a new home including land was \$15.63. Ten years later, this cost had gone up 203 percent to \$31.68. But the median income had also risen 199 percent to \$17.200

We think this same pattern will prevail in the years ahead, but with some changes that will help future buyers. We see, and this will be in answer to demand, smaller single-family homes being built on smaller lots — both designed to hold down costs and bring affordable new housing back into the reach of more buyers.


The growth in condominium construction and sales has been a highlight of real estate transactions during the past few years. We see this growing at an accelerated pace along with the construction of townhouses.

Recently one of Detroit's largest board of realtors reported that the average price of homes sold in October was \$53,500, down from an average of \$55,200 in July. Reflecting the slower sales pace, the ratio of sales to listings was 33 percent, compared to 60 percent a year ago when the real estate market was very active.

THE EVIDENCE IS already abundantly clear that there has been a dramatic downward change in the housing and real estate markets in the last two months.

What must happen before this situation will reverse itself? Two things:

First of all, interest rates must come down; and second, the rate of savings growth must increase.

The results of the Fed's action of October will, in the next few months, help to bring about much lower rates because there will be less demand. I have mentioned the effect of high mortgage rates on the real estate markets and the demand for mortgage loans, and I am sure that the recent commercial bank prime rate high of 15 31/2 percent has had a similar effect on bank lending.

As business activity slows and loan demand drops, we will see lower interest rates. As a matter of fact, and as you are well aware, within the past week there have been some slight reductions In mortgage rates and in the commercial bank

Short-term money market rates will, and have, dropped, and as they do, rates paid on savings accounts will become more attractive, and this should produce increased deposits.

The present economic conditions are not totally unlike the

last go-around of high rates, tight money and recession during the mid-70s. During that period, T-Bill rates rose from a low of 4 percent in the first quarter of 1972, to a high of 10.3 percent in the third quarter of 1974.

Following that peak, short-term T-Bill rates fell to 6 percent in the first quarter of 1975. That signaled the end of tight money. Savings flows picked up, and mortgage money becamereadily available. That put downward pressure on mortgage rates, which dropped from a high of 31/2 percent in September of 1974, to a low of 8 11/4 percent in April of 1977.

In connection with these remarks about the outlook for 1980, it is appropriate to talk about next year's legislative and regulatory influences upon the home financing industry. Congress and financial institution regulators will be making decisions on several major and far-reaching issues of financial reform during 1980.

Our government has signaled a substantial shift in its attitude toward providing better yield opportunities for the smallbalance saver. Inflationary pressure and special interest groups, such as the Grey Panthers, have caught the attention of Congress.

CONCERN FOR THE small saver, and also concern for the small rate of American savings in general, is generating considerable congressional interest in the area of income tax incentives for interest earned on savings accounts.

No fewer than 33 separate bills have been introduced in this session of Congress. The general theme of current proposed legislation would provide a tax exemption of \$100 to \$200 for individual savers. Twice that amount would be tax exempt for joint returns.
