Farmland preservation top concern at hearing

Farmland preservation — the most prominent feature of Canton's proposed zoning ordinance — drew opposition from several landowners at a public hearing last week.

Other citizens objected to proposed apartment zoning on Ford Road and the down zoning of some parcels to less intensive uses.

Only a fraction of the estimated 150 persons who attended the hearing spoke. They filled less than half the seats in the auditorium of Plymouth Salem High School.

Comments on the farmland preservation issue surpassed all others in terms of numbers. Landowners complained that the program confiscates their rights as property owners.

Judy Kohl of the League of Women Voters said the LWV supports the preservation program as long as landowners are treated "in a fair and equitable manner."

THE PROPOSED zoning ordinance and map reserves some 5,000 acres west of Canton Center for agricultural purposes.

All farming activities such as growing crops and maintaining livestock are allowed in the agricultural-industrial zones. Land in those districts cannot be split into parcels of less than 40 acres, although existing smaller parcels are not required to merge. Only one house is allowed on each parcel of 40 acres or less.

The agricultural-residential zones call for parcels of a minimum five acres. Farming activities are also allowed in those zoning classifications.

A proposed development rights program would reimburse landowners in the agricultural-industrial district for their lost ability to develop their land. The township board has resolved to place another development rights proposal on the ballot by May 1981.

Voters narrowly defeated a four mill proposal (\$4 per \$1,000 assessed prop-

erty valuation) to finance the program in November 1978.

Township planners have admitted that zoning classifications in the western half of the township will have to be revised if a development rights question is defeated a second time.

The township has been committed to farmland preservation since 1976 — the year the township's master plan was adopted, however.

The proposed zoning documents carry out the intent of the master plan by defining land use designations and indicating the zoning of specific parcels.

"Henry David Thoreau once said that if you put castles in the air, you simply have to put a foundation under them," said planner Jim Kosteva at Thursday's hearing. "The master plan can be considered the castle in the air, and the zoning ordinance is the foundation."

SEVERAL LANDOWNERS at the hearing expressed resentment of the township's efforts to lock their land into agricultural uses prior to adoption of a development rights program.

Duane Bordine, whose family owns 115 acres in the proposed agricultural-industrial district, is one of the township's few remaining farmers who still owns the land he tills.

"We've had our land since Andrew Jackson's time — 1832," Bordine said. "And we've paid over \$100,000 in taxes. There's no way we'll ever be compensated for that."

Bordine said his mother would have to move from her home on one of the family parcels if she was forced to sell her land for financial reasons. The proposed ordinance would prohibit the separation of the housing site from the rest of the parcel.

"That's one hell of a way to treat senior citizens in Canton Township," Bordine said.

Realtor Harold Fischer called the proposed ordinance "a great injustice." "By the action of this township,

you're taking these people's (land) values away," he said. "Agriculture is no longer a viable industry in Wayne County."

BART BERG, a former member of the planning commission, objected to the proposed down zoning of land from commercial to agricultural-residential on Michigan Avenue west of Canton Center.

Water and sewer services are available along the highway which was "the main road west prior to the expressway era," he said.

"I have a difficult time trying to understand the down zoning of that area."

Other citizens voiced objections to additional planning commission proposals to down zone various parcels.

Paul Vilyner, whose land is currently zoned for 80-foot residential lots, said the proposed zoning ordinance would increase the minimal lot size on his land and destroy his plans to plat the acreage.

"They're trying to take away my retirement," he said.

Several homeowners lobbied for a rezoning of land at the southeast corner of Ford and Morton Taylor from commercial to single-family residential. The proposed zoning map changes the commercial zoning to multiple-family residential.

"Canton is already becoming a town of transients," said one man in objection to the proposed apartment designation.

Robert Padgett, chairman of the planning commission, said the comments of citizens will be considered when planners make a recommendation on the proposed zoning documents at their Feb. 11 meeting. The commission has been working on the proposed ordinance and map since 1976.

Padgett expects the township board will hold its own hearing on the documents next month before making a final determination on the matter.

Anti-draft rally fires emotions

One of the most well-known anti-war slogans of the Vietnam era — "Hell no, we won't go" — was exchanged for "We won't kill for Capitol Hill" by about 100 anti-draft protesters in Kellogg Park Friday.

Reminiscent of another time and another conflict, the rally was staged in protest of an anticipated forced draft registration as prompted by growing tensions in the Persian Gulf.

The rally was organized by two local Centennial Educational Park students to coincide with President Carter's anticipated announcement the same evening.

In the cold of the afternoon, banners reading "Blood for Oil?" and chants — "No draft, no war" — colored the mid-town setting.

"We should protect our freedom by not registering for the draft," said Dale Ewart, a key speaker and member of PIRGIM. "Our freedom is not being taken away by the Soviets, it's not being taken away by the Iranians, it's being taken away by President Carter at Capitol Hill."

"Forced registration is unconstitutional — and our constitution protects our freedom."

FOLLOWING EWART'S speech was Vietnam veteran Joe Volk, a member of the American Friends Service Committee.

After two years in the army, he deserted and spent six months in prison.

"Remember, by registering you're being asked to enlist in the

State's economy worse than most, economist says

Forecasts for Michigan's economic climate are even bleaker than the dismal predictions for the nation as a whole, a University of Michigan economist told Canton's business community last week.

Although the predictions are from rosy, Joan Crary, a scientific researcher for U-M's economics department, said the state of the economy during the next 1½ years should top the sluggish economy of the 1974-75 recession.

Some of her predictions show an improvement in the economic climate over inflation-ridden 1979.

Michigan's inflation rate should fall from last year's average of 14.3 percent to about 10 percent, she said.

But the other side of the state's economic picture indicates unemployment is expected to rise from last year's level of 7.8 percent to an average 10 percent. Ms. Crary expects the unemployment rate will peak in mid-1981 at 10.9 percent before improvements are shown in that area.

"Certainly, this picture is bleak for the Michigan economy," said Ms. Crary

at a luncheon meeting of the Canton Chamber of Commerce. "It's not really a recession, but it's not booming along either."

MS. CRARY said certain factors contributing to the sluggishness of the national economy indicate an even bleaker economic climate in Michigan over the next 18 months.

No marked increase is seen in the production of automobiles and heavy equipment — key industries in the state. Capital investments were down at the close of 1979.

She predicts a national unemployment rate of 7.1 percent and a nationwide inflation rate of 9 percent, compared to state forecasts of 10 percent for each.

In the 1974-75 recession, Ms. Crary said national unemployment was pegged several notches higher at 12.4 percent. Inflation averaged 10.9 percent in 1974 and 7.5 percent in 1975.

Ms. Crary said it is not unusual for Michigan to receive the brunt of eco-

Short Takes

Get those buses rolling

The high price of gasoline has convinced township board members that Canton needs improved mass transit services. Supervisor Noel Culbert recently forwarded a township request for additional bus service to the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA). Currently, only two buses run from Canton to downtown Detroit in the early morning and evening hours. "I was told that it's very probable they'll expand bus service in Canton," Culbert said of a SEMTA representative's response.

Drivers' pet peeve

The intersection of Warren and Sheldon roads is among the most frequently complained about in Canton Township because of the absence of a traffic light. But help may be coming for impatient motorists, according to Supervisor Noel Culbert. He has asked the Wayne County Road Commission (WCRC) to install a traffic signal at the corner because of the number of complaints his office has received. The WCRC is expected to make a traffic study at the intersection before making its decision.

Environmental award

Canton's very own Crimboli Landscape Contractors Inc. has been presented the environmental merit award by the Associated Landscape Contractors of America. The award, for a Terry Barr Sales landscaping project, was presented for "significant accomplishment in the enrichment of the natural environment, specifically in the field of erosion control."

James Jones, construction manager for Crimboli, said, "naturally we feel very proud of such recognition from ALCA. The job was an especially difficult one — so much so that no other contractors were willing to undertake it."

The ALCA is the official trade association of the landscape contracting industry.

On Valentine's Day WSDP Radio will be celebrating its eighth year of broadcasting at Plymouth Salem High School.

WSDP has been serving the Plymouth-Canton community since 1972. The station is operated by more than 70

high school students enrolled at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

Recently the station increased its power from 10 to 200 watts. The staff operates under the supervision of John Seidelman and Jeffrey Cardinal.

Bus buy OK asked

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education will be asked to approve the purchase of 15 buses at today's meeting.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in board offices at 454 S. Harvey.

In other business, the board also will be asked to adopt the formal resolution setting the special bond issue election for March 27, will be asked to ratify a contract for cafeteria employees, and will be asked to hire a ninth area coordinator for the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

THE BUS PURCHASE is being asked for because the district now has 15 worn-out buses which need to be replaced.

Of the 15 buses the state has fully reimbursed the school district for 14 of them, explained Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business.

The 15th bus, about 70 percent amortized, is the second oldest wheel chair bus in the fleet and is facing major repairs having logged 95,000 miles, Hoedel said.

Of the 15 buses, five were purchased in 1971 and have mileage ranging from 72,967 to 104,881. Another seven buses were purchased in 1972 and have mileage ranging from 65,804 to 95,658. Two vans were purchased in 1973 with odometer readings of 78,652 and 85,475.

Of the 12 fullsize buses to be replaced, Hoedel says five will be traded in. The remaining seven buses will be sold to the public sometime next fall after the district knows its student count and bus routes.

IN ASKING FOR the board to approve the replacements, Hoedel noted that the need for school buses in the school district is continuing to expand faster than student enrollment.

"This apparent oddity is the result of two factors. First, while the number of students per household is going down, the number of households is going up. Bus routes and total bus miles are directly related to the number of households.

"More miles must be traveled each morning and afternoon to cover large residential areas for the same busloads of students.

"The second factor is the consolidation of more students in the same number of schools. Building a new school means more walkers and fewer bus riders.

"Going to Extended School Year (ESY) produces fewer walkers and more bus riders. We are experiencing both of these factors.

"Fleet expansion is taking up part of the excess," added Hoedel, "and more miles per bus per year is accounting for the remainder."

'Will they make it alone?'

For these mothers, tomorrow's a burden

In an average size elementary school classroom last week, a group of women were talking about the concerns they share for their growing children.

They talked of the endless demands of raising a child — some of its joys and also some of the more personal humorous moments.

In appearance they're young, mid-20s to early 30s, and appeared confident and eloquent.

Conversation later turned to their

hopes for an uncertain future.

"I just don't think people realize the retarded are someone's children," one mother said.

"We're all concerned about tomorrow, and there's nothing available at this point," added another mother.

She was talking about the future — her child's homelife as an adult.

These 12 mothers are all raising toddlers who have various mental and physical handicaps. They meet twice a month at Farrand School in Plymouth Township, which hosts the Plymouth-

Canton School District's Infant-Preschool Special Education Program.

To the unsuspecting observer, these gatherings are similar to informal rap sessions. But quickly one realizes the meetings provide a rare insight into the lives of women whose lifestyles are shaped by the presence of a handicapped child in their home.

"I DON'T THINK you know what you're in for — how it's going to change your life," said Barbara Waters, the mother of two retarded youngsters.

As residents of the Plymouth community and Canton Township, one of the most poignant aspects of their group discussion last week centered on the proposed development of three Canton homes for retarded children and adults.

Although their own children are still infants — less than 3 years old — none can ignore the thought of what their children's lives will be like when they reach adulthood.

"At least there's some hope — which sounds terrible. But I don't want her to live with us for the rest of my life," said Ms. Waters.

"To have him functioning on his own would give him some satisfaction," said Gail Bowers, whose son has Down's syndrome.

One of the mothers, who was at a Canton residents' meeting last week to discuss those proposed homes, expressed shock upon hearing some less than humane comments.

"It sounded like they were talking about animals roaming the streets," said Lisa Walker, also a mother of a Down's syndrome baby.

The majority of Canton subdivision residents at the meeting were opposed to plans for an adult care home for the mentally retarded.

"The whole issue has changed in a very different way for me," Mrs. Walker said. "When you're hit with a Down baby, the whole thing flips over."

"YOU HAVE TO accept that they're different and people will stop to ask questions.

"That sounds cruel, but I resent those people who look and just walk by without saying anything even more than those who will stop and ask — 'Hey, what's wrong with your kid?'" said Mrs. Waters.

Most of the women agreed they still experience guilt and resentment associated with having a handicapped child.

Those are feelings that are difficult to overcome.

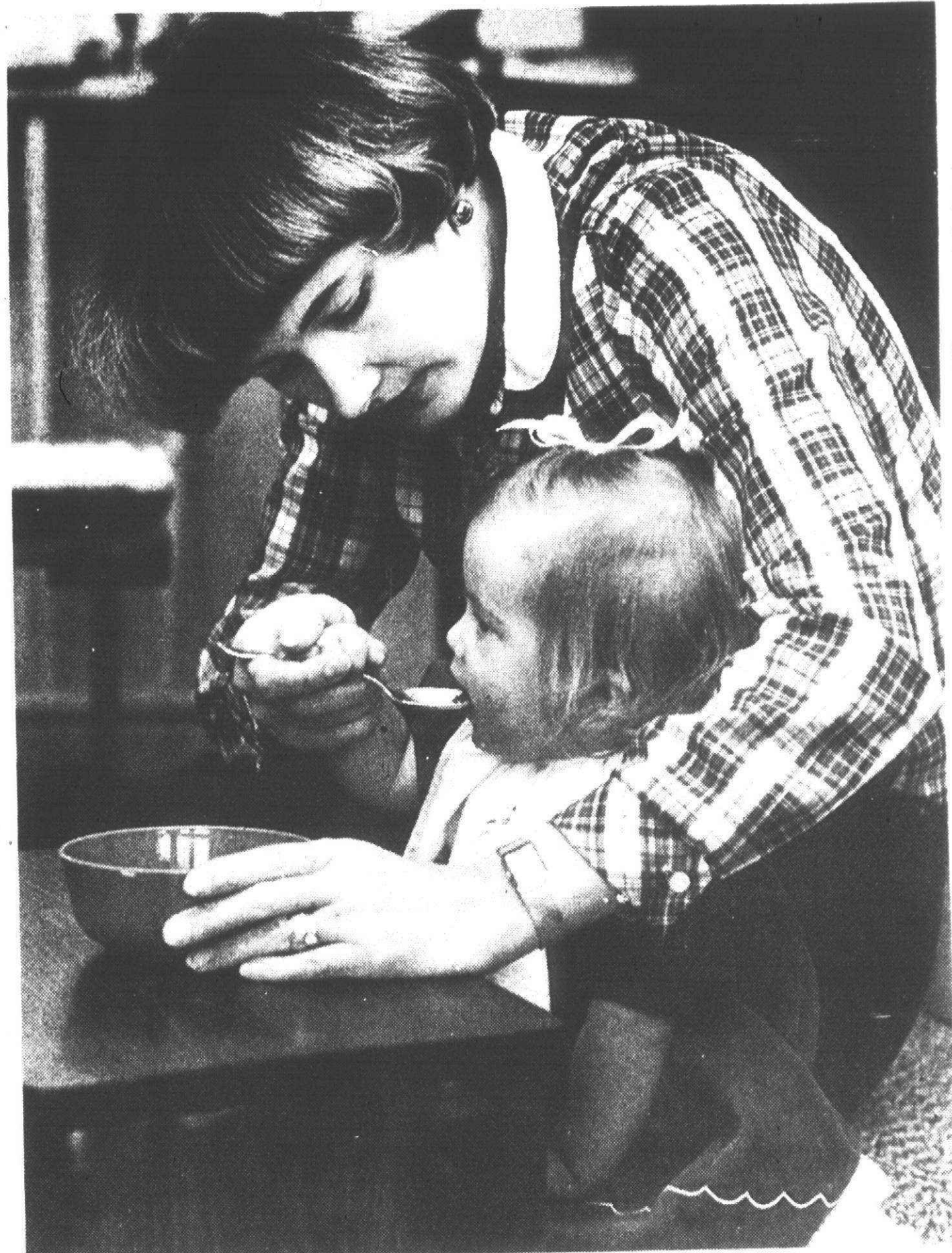
Some said they felt they were being "punished" by having a handicapped child. Others said they felt guilty over their handling of their pregnancies.

"I feel bad sometimes that I seem to love him (the handicapped) child more

army to kill people," he said. "Registration is the first step to saying war is thinkable. And that's what you do when you go in the army. You learn to kill and become killers without even thinking about it."

"The U.S. has never had a registration without a draft. And the U.S. has never had a draft without a war."

Instead of joining the army, Volk advocated another "army" service — "the non-violent movement for peace and justice."

Ingrid Smith, of the Women's Intervention League for Peace and Freedom, spoke out against what she called growing nostalgia over war. She said movies such as "Yanks" and "1941" were responsible for fostering those feelings.

"There's a certain glow about World War II that's coming out. People think Vietnam was just an exception but they're wrong. War is war. We are not alarmists but we hear the rumblings."

One unexpected pronouncement came from a 15-year-old female student from Plymouth-Canton Schools.

She said: "I'm 15-year-old and I don't feel I'm ready to make a decision to take another life right now — when I'm 18 — or when I'm 80. I don't think I'm prepared to make a decision I'm not prepared to do."

But the anti-draft speeches and personal testimonies did not go without some challenge from another group, small in numbers but carrying equal emotion for their position.

WEARING POST CAPS was a handful of members from Plymouth's VFW. From the start, the rally was faced with the threat of splintering apart as small groups broke away to argue with the veterans.

One of the most outspoken was Plymouth resident Gary Kubik, who fought in Vietnam for four years.

Kubik, a past commander of the local post, said: "What I don't like about these people being here is that most are from outside of the city. They're overplaying the connection between draft registration and actual drafting. People register to vote and don't have to vote."

"We fought for this country and gave them the right to do this (protest). But half of them we wouldn't want in the army anyways. They've got posters up there that are un-American."

As another speaker was advocating other alternatives to the use of foreign oil — like wood burning and walking — "We don't want their oil, it's not our oil anyways" — Karla Karinen and Cheryl Pijanowski explained why they helped organize the Plymouth rally.

"We're both forced into it either way and have friends who would be," said Pijanowski.

nomie hard times. In 1979, rates for both unemployment and inflation were higher than the national average. Economists pegged the national inflation rate at 12.7 percent.

Ms. Cray added, however, that Detroit economic figures are used to estimate rates for the state as a whole. No overall measure exists at the current time.

MS. CRARY admitted that economic forecasts vary widely and many predictions fail to materialize.

"At the end of 1979, we were pleased and surprised that, once again, a recession did not develop," she said.

Forecasts are based on historic trends in the economy, current economic conditions and assumptions concerning future monetary policies of the federal government and pricing trends of key goods, she explained.

Ms. Cray said the buying power of Americans decreased by 4.4 percent in 1979 because wage increases did not keep pace with inflation.

Assumptions in Ms. Cray's 18-month economic forecast include a predicted 32 percent increase in gasoline prices, a 12 percent increase in farm prices, a

14 percent increase in defense spending and no increase in the nation's Gross National Product (GNP) until next summer.

Ms. Cray's predictions did not seem to adversely affect the plans of businesspersons at last week's luncheon, however.

Chamber of Commerce president Frank MacMurray asked for a show of hands indicating planned business expansion or employee lay-offs in 1980. Only a handful of businesspersons in the crowded room responded to either question.

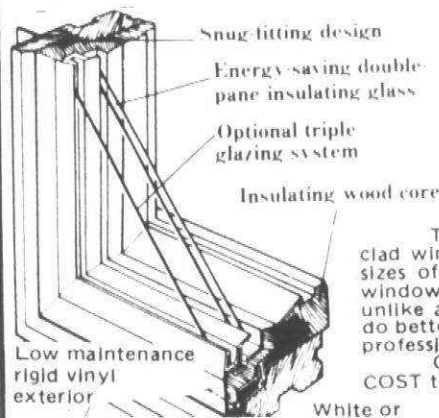
Ms. Cray cautioned, however, that her prediction of a 10 percent Michigan unemployment rate does not necessarily mean widespread layoffs. Unemployment figures include new persons in the labor force who are seeking work, she said.

Local payments for jobless breaks earlier '74-75 mark

All records for unemployment compensation paid out of the Plymouth-Canton district office were broken last week when the total was in excess of \$100,000.

"And I don't know where it is going to stop," Ed Dowling, branch manager, said as he looked at the lines outside and the commotion in the office.

The rise in the unemployment ranks to just above 10 percent has put added pressure on the Plymouth office to the point that it was necessary to rent additional space in the VFW building on Mill Street.

With the layoffs (temporary and permanent) in the auto industry, the number of claims handled in the Plymouth office now has passed the 9,200 mark and still growing.

According to Dowling, the present pressure on his office far exceeds that experienced in 1974-75.

"Don't forget, our present list of claimants takes in, for the most part, those laid off at the auto plants. With the drop off of production there, the suppliers will be the next to feel it. When that happens, then the pressure here will increase."

"With a half smile, he added, "And this is considered a small office."

AS DOWLING looked about the office and the hustle and bustle of all the clerks at all the various counters, he stated that the added work load has also meant an increase in his staff from 25 to 61 persons.

"And we may need more, unless there is a break somewhere along the line," Dowling said.

The one thing he is grateful for is the mild winter and the lack of snow.

"When you drive along here in the mornings and see the long lines, it makes you feel good to know that there is no snow and ice and heavy drifts. Those conditions would make it terrible" for those having to wait in line for their benefits.

How can his staff take care of so many payments each week and keep up with the demand?

Dowling said that several years ago he put the claimants on a two-week basis. That enabled the staff to handle the rush. But now it seems to be getting worse and there is no telling just how bad things will be.

He also said that he thought conditions during the 1974-75 period were bad and he never thought they could get worse. But now they have far exceeded the conditions then and, as he put it, "the end is not in sight".

Up to now, he said, there has been no talk of diminishing cash supply, but "it will stop some time. It can't go on like this."

The present payments are taken from the money placed in the fund by the various employers. When these funds are exhausted, the entire program may be in trouble, he explained.

Just what will happen then Dowling didn't say, but of one thing he is sure at the moment — the record high of \$100,000 in payments for a single week in the Plymouth area will be broken, possibly next week.

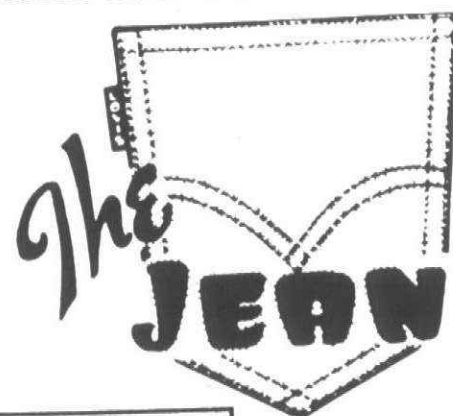

Monday's Commentary

Working journalists must close ranks to those who work for government

Times change. Ask Bill Joyner.

A generation ago, the announcement that County Commissioner R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, was being appointed managing editor of Associated Newspapers would have been shrugged at. Historically, journalism and American politics have been hand-in-glove.

Not in 1980. The stuff hit the rotating air circulator when the announcement came out early last week that Joyner would be head man in the weekly chain's editorial department, with powers to manage, plan news coverage and write editorials.

One of their reporters told one of our reporters that 25 calls from angry politicians came in. "This makes me sick to my stomach," said their reporter. Joyner is smart. He promptly quit.

"If there's even the slightest hint of impropriety," he said, "I don't want to do it."

THE PRESS-POLITICS connection is as old as the Republic.

My hero, Treasury Secretary Alexander Hamilton, was founder of what is now the New York Post. Hamilton wrote articles under the *nom de plume* of Publius. Many of those diamond-like "Federalist Papers" saw the first light of day in newspapers.

Thomas Jefferson, too, had such press connections, wrote John Tebbell in his "Compact History of American Newspapers."

American newspapers began as the publicity arm of political parties, wrote Tebbell. A printer would set up shop and print whatever anyone wanted — business cards, circus posters, bills of lading, newspapers.

The party would simply hire him to print the paper.

"The division and specialization of labor," as Adam Smith called it, came in, and editors were hired to write the material.

When the politicians of the 18th century wrote freedom of the press into the Constitution, they weren't thinking of protecting the commercial media. They were protecting their own megaphones.

Not until the 1830s did James Gordon Bennett, in the now departed New York Herald, make a distinction between fact and opinion. He conceived the notions of 1) selling facts as a commodity and 2) segregating opinion onto the "editorial" page.

In the same era, newspapers began to get more commercial advertising. This lessened their dependence on politicians for legal advertising. The development "palpably improved" newspapers, according to Encyclopedia Americana, which adds:

"The elder journalism was largely political pamphleteering. The later journalism is the complete mirror of daily life."

IN THE 20TH century, the press has been a jumping off point for politicians.

Warren Harding was once a publisher. The late Adlai Stevenson II, the Illinois governor, presiden-

tial candidate and United Nations ambassador, was from the family that owned a daily paper. His lucid speeches showed a consciousness of newspaper style.

U.S. Sen. Arthur Vandenburg, R-Mich., was editor of the late Grand Rapids Herald before being appointed in 1928 to the U.S. Senate. When Vandenburg died, Blair Moody, the Detroit News' Washington bureau chief, was appointed in 1951 to succeed him.

Most modern newsmen, however, sever their old connections when they go political. Similarly, most politicians — for example, Bill Moyers — generally sever their political connections when they go back to media.

Now about Bill Joyner.

PUBLISHER David Willett at Associated said he saw no conflict of interest in Joyner's being a county commissioner and a managing editor. Willett said he even checked with the Michigan Press Association, which said there was precedent. Of course, there was precedent. But times change.

Too bad he didn't check with working newspaper. My colleagues and I see plenty of chances for conflict.

First, as voters we were told in 1978 by candidate Joyner that he would devote full attention to his county job. Now, after less than a full term, he was proposing to become a half-time, half-pay commissioner. Wayne County is in dismal enough shape without one of the progressives half-turning away.

Second, as journalists, we at the Observer would have been extremely uncomfortable covering Commissioner Joyner. Would he give a good story or quote to his own paper and a dull one to us? Would he break a good story on a Friday so our twice-weekly papers could have it on Monday, or hold it back so that both his once-a-week papers and ours would have it on Thursday?

Third, you as readers would have had to wonder about us if we failed to quote Joyner in a county story. "Is the Observer ignoring Joyner because it doesn't want to publicize the editor of another paper?" you might ask — and it would have been a fair question.

Fourth, journalists know Joyner has no professional experience as a journalist. If he has ever worked on a paper, it must have been in his school days. The prospect that one so untested would leap over those who had labored in the vineyards was depressing to all journalists, especially those at Associated. We thought education and experience were the keys to success.

Fifth, the society of professional journalists, Sigma Delta Chi, has a code of ethics which says in part:

"Secondary employment, political involvement, holding public office and service in com-

munity organizations should be avoided if it compromises the integrity of journalists and their employers."

As a commissioner and working newsman, Joyner would have had a substantial conflict of interest.

THE REASON I'm giving one county commissioner so much space is that it's only one local manifestation of a global problem.

In Communist and many "third world" countries, there is no such thing as a commercial press independent of government. They see information and news as a function of government, just like courts or sweeping the streets.

With that mind-set, they look at American reporters as tools of the government and expel my brethren accordingly from their lands as "spies." Alas, they sometimes have a bit of a case.

Sometimes American newsmen have acted as agents of the government. When it happens, we denounce it in our trade literature and hope to discourage others from doing it. We can't call ourselves free journalists if we are agents of government.

Sometimes agents of government pose as journalists. We resent it. It endangers the credibility of all journalists.

Sometimes we are under court order to behave, after the fact, as government agents. Consider the Cadillac murder case last year in which a woman was charged with murdering her husband.

The court-appointed defense attorney didn't bother to visit his client, and she languished in jail until a reporter from the Traverse City Record-Eagle visited her. The woman proceeded to bare her soul about the abuse she had suffered.

The prosecutor, reading the story, sensed a chance to skip his homework. He sought and got a court order to procure the reporter's notes.

Thus, the reporter, intending to perform a good faith service by getting the accused widow's side of the story, found herself turned into a tool of the prosecutor. It was a dirty trick. It was unfair to the accused, and it damaged the credibility of an excellent newspaper.

Suppose you were accused of a serious crime. Would you accept my invitation to relate your side of the story to the community if you thought I would be turned into a tool of the authority prosecuting you?

DO YOU SEE? The world has changed, and we working journalists dare not have government officials in our ranks. Not any more.

To his credit, Joyner quit the newspaper job as soon as he saw the light. He can give society nobler service at 2 Woodward Ave. by continuing to dilute the stream of jackasserie that gushes from county government.

Farewell, embellishments

Trustee Carol Bodenmiller called it "the big brown elephant."

Around here, we call it Canton Keep.

Others know it only as that big brown building rising from the cornfields just west of Canton Center Road.

The building, little more than a year old, is known officially as the Canton Township administration building. It cost more than \$2 million to build, with most of the funding coming from federal grants.

In fact, many communities during the past few years took advantage of federal grants to build administration buildings. Livonia's new city hall, for example, owes its gleaming presence to federal money (build a building, get a check).

Township hall, like most of the buildings constructed under the federal grants, cost more than it was supposed to. The extra costs didn't come from someone's decision to throw in an extra corinthian column, a gargyle overlooking the parking lot or ornate geegaws around the doors.

They simply don't make community buildings like they used too. Township

Hall is streamlined, with bright primary colors and lots of Formica.

There is no elaborate wood paneling, no pale oak floors that show dust balls when the sun strikes, no benches in waiting areas pitted with carvings and initials.

There is no graffiti.

Yes, Canton Township Hall is a thoroughly modern building. Township officials, staff, district court employees and eventually township library employees and visitors don't have to contend with the headaches of old municipal facilities.

The plumbing usually works, although the district courtroom in the basement was flooded during heavy rains last spring.

There are modern new elevators, although Supervisor Noel Culbert got stuck in the elevator for several hours one evening. There appear to be no other problems with rats or other rodents, although the third floor was deluged by a particular species of fly in the fall.

On the whole, it's a quite nice build-

ing, as far as brand, spanking new township halls go.

But some of those antiquated old buildings that have since been discarded by the communities that built them (and admittedly there aren't many in the relatively new suburbs) have something Canton's administration building doesn't — personality.

It may not be the best personality in the world, it may even be a creepy one, but it is a personality nevertheless.

It seems unlikely that even age will give these new, streamlined municipal facilities a personality.

It's just not practical to put up municipal buildings the way they did once upon a time, with the fancy plaster, the soaring ceilings, the parquet floors.

Any modern attempt would probably end up ugly as sin and twice as expensive.

Guess that's why it's comforting to know there is still room at township hall for such lowly additions as a bird feeder outside, placed there by Clerk John Flodin.

But we'll draw the line at plastic pink flamingos.

Meanwhile, residents will be going to the polls next month to vote on a school bond issue and maintenance levy which will cost about 3 mills the first year.

Costs of a lot of other things are going up, too. But people seem to get more upset about taxes going up than all the other things.

In this country, there is a taxpayers' revolt going on. But there has been no rent revolt, mortgage revolt, insurance revolt, gasoline revolt or food revolt. The nearest thing to a tax revolt was the meat boycott a few years ago, but at a much lower emotional pitch.

WALKING INTO THE tax revolt are a few state representatives who would like to reduce property taxes as part of a tax reform package.

Among them is Rep. Roy Smith, R-Saline, whose 52nd District includes the city of Plymouth and part of Plymouth Township.

Smith has been working with both parties in Lansing trying to drum up support for comprehensive tax reform. He has been plugging away now for about four years, and isn't about to give up now.

In fact, Smith has formed a working alliance recently with an unlikely ally — a liberal Democrat whose views on other issues are quite different from how ol' Roy thinks about things.

But on tax reform, Reps. Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor and Roy Smith think alike — it's long overdue and should be done now. The two are pushing a tax reform package, basically the same one Smith put together a few years back, and are working with state Sen. Gary Corbin, D-Clio on another major proposal.

PROPERTY TAXES could be cut by

as much as 40 percent under the Smith/Bullard plan.

Bullard backs the plan but admits it represents "years of fine tuning and modifications by Rep. Smith." The plan calls for a **maximum** of 15 mills to be optionally levied for public education, including special and vocational education.

Residents would be given the choice of a local 1 percent income tax instead of the optional 12 mills reserved for general education.

Senior citizens would be exempt from all property taxes on the first \$25,000 of their homestead's assessed value, with the state reimbursing local governments for this lost revenue.

To generate revenue for education, the state would be permitted to levy a statewide property tax of up to 32.5 mills on all types of real estate except residential property and farmland owned by a resident.

The Legislature would be required to establish a program of general state taxation and a method for distributing funds to ensure equal per-pupil state financial support for all local school districts.

THE CORBIN PLAN would increase the state sales tax by one cent and earmark the added revenue for property tax relief.

Property tax relief would be realized by providing a \$3,000 homestead exemption for every homestead in the state, with the state reimbursing local governments for lost revenue.

The Corbin tax shift plan also would provide a sales tax credit on the state income tax to offset the impact of increasing the state sales tax on lower income individuals.

As the yield of state sales tax grows, the homestead exemptions would be increased.

To become law, both the Smith/Bullard and Corbin plans must be placed on the ballot next fall, by either a two-thirds vote of the Legislature or by a petition drive.

"These two tax plans respond to in-

creasing unhappiness with property taxation," explains Bullard. "Irresponsible tax slashers, however, will once again offer 'meat-axe' property tax reduction as a constitutional amendment next November."

"Any proposal which drastically reduces property taxation without providing replacement revenue sources, would decimate local government and educational systems."

LOCAL GOVERNMENT officials in the past haven't reacted with much enthusiasm towards Smith tax reform plan.

One reason has been the fear of a loss of "local control." And local control is considered as sacred as neighborhood schools, trees, and law and order.

Another reason is that "local quality" would be eroded if the local property tax were replaced by any kind of statewide financing system. Local communities should have the option of paying more for more quality if that's what they want, goes the argument.

The 12-mill or 1 percent income tax local options are enrichment alternatives which answer, in part, the "local quality" argument.

But I think that's really academic. I don't hear a whole lot of local property owners speaking out in favor of spending more tax dollars for more local quality.

I believe the past arguments against tax shift plans, like Smith/Bullard, have been washed out by the tax revolt. Anyone who would hack property taxes in half without replacement of revenue doesn't care much about local control and local quality.

I always felt the arguments on loss of control and loss of quality were exaggerated. But that's an old debate I can't get excited about now.

The real issue now, it seems to me, is whether we want to listen to a Bob Tisch or a Roy Smith. I've always liked ol' Roy and am growing fonder of him every day.

Gattoni move gives Rocks perfect season

Heavyweight Greg Gattoni's comeback in the last match Thursday night enabled Plymouth Salem to enjoy its first ever perfect dual-meet wrestling season.

A takedown move in the final 20 second gave Gattoni and his teammates a dramatic 24-23 mat victory at Trenton in a showdown for first place honors in the Suburban Eight League.

sioned Ken Barnes, 6-0.

At 114 pounds Trenton regained the lead when Jeff Owens defeated Jeff Dunson, 15-3.

Jeff Brown (121) cut the margin for Salem with an 8-2 decision over Allan Burghmooser. Teammate Mark Ross, coming from behind like Gattoni, reversed Jerry Frebes to score a 7-4 decision.

Salem regular Bruce Bachman (134)

was out because of illness. His replacement, Rob McDonald, was pinned by Trenton's Tom Tarjgeff.

Jerry Valchine (140) of Salem made it 41 victories this season with an 8-3 decision over Bob Harshaw.

Visser lights up rims

Canton cagers tip Mott, 73-56

Plymouth Canton convinced Western Six League basketball followers Friday night that the race for first place is far from over.

The Chiefs, behind Dave Visser's incredible first-half play, marched all over league leader Waterford Mott for a 73-56 victory.

Canton's must victory tightened up the league race considerably. Mott, which suffered its first league loss, dropped to 6-1 while Canton moved up to 5-2.

Mott must still play Northville and Farmington Harrison (4-3) on the road. "We're looking for some help now," said Canton Coach Craig Bell, whose team upped their overall record to 9-6.

"Visser's on top of his game right now. He moves so well without the ball."

Canton opened up a 19-11 first quarter lead with a potent fast break. The Chiefs continued their assault in the second period with a 25-16 blitz to lead at intermission, 44-27.

"We moved the ball well and our guards were taking the ball into our offense," said Bell. "That's a compliment to our team."

"We're doing the things a team has to do to win."

Canton, noted for its slow third quarters, held Mott to just seven points with some stingy defensive strategy.

Guard Scott Adler, who finished with 14 points, tallied six in that quarter as Canton upped its advantage to 56-34.

Dave Ursa's basket with 2:06 to go in the game gave the Chiefs their biggest lead of the night, 70-46.

"Our shooting let us down tonight," said Robinson. "We were taking the ball alot and going one-on-one. We didn't move the ball at all. You have to give Canton some credit with that."

Canton held a wide margin on the

boards as Visser grabbed eight and Sean Houle collected seven. Dave Malek, who scored 10 points, had three steals.

The Chiefs found the open man all night with Visser getting five.

CANTON HELD Mott's leading scorer, Tom Schaeffer, to just nine. He carried a 17 point-per-game average into the game.

Forward Keith Hart, a 6-4 senior, led Mott with 14 points. He scored his team's first eight points, all on drives to the basket in the first quarter. Dave Miller, a powerful 6-4 senior, added 10 points.

Canton will take its four-game win streak into Tuesday's home encounter with Dearborn, a member of the Suburban Eight League.

"I've seen them (Dearborn) play and they have some good athletes," warned Bell. "What we have to do is maintain our level wherever we play."

THE CANTON junior varsity squad pulled into a first-place tie in the league by beating Mott, 64-51, as Bill Hanis and Steve Tuttle led the winners with 17 and 15 points, respectively.

Matt Thomas and Tom Harris both chipped in 10 for Canton.

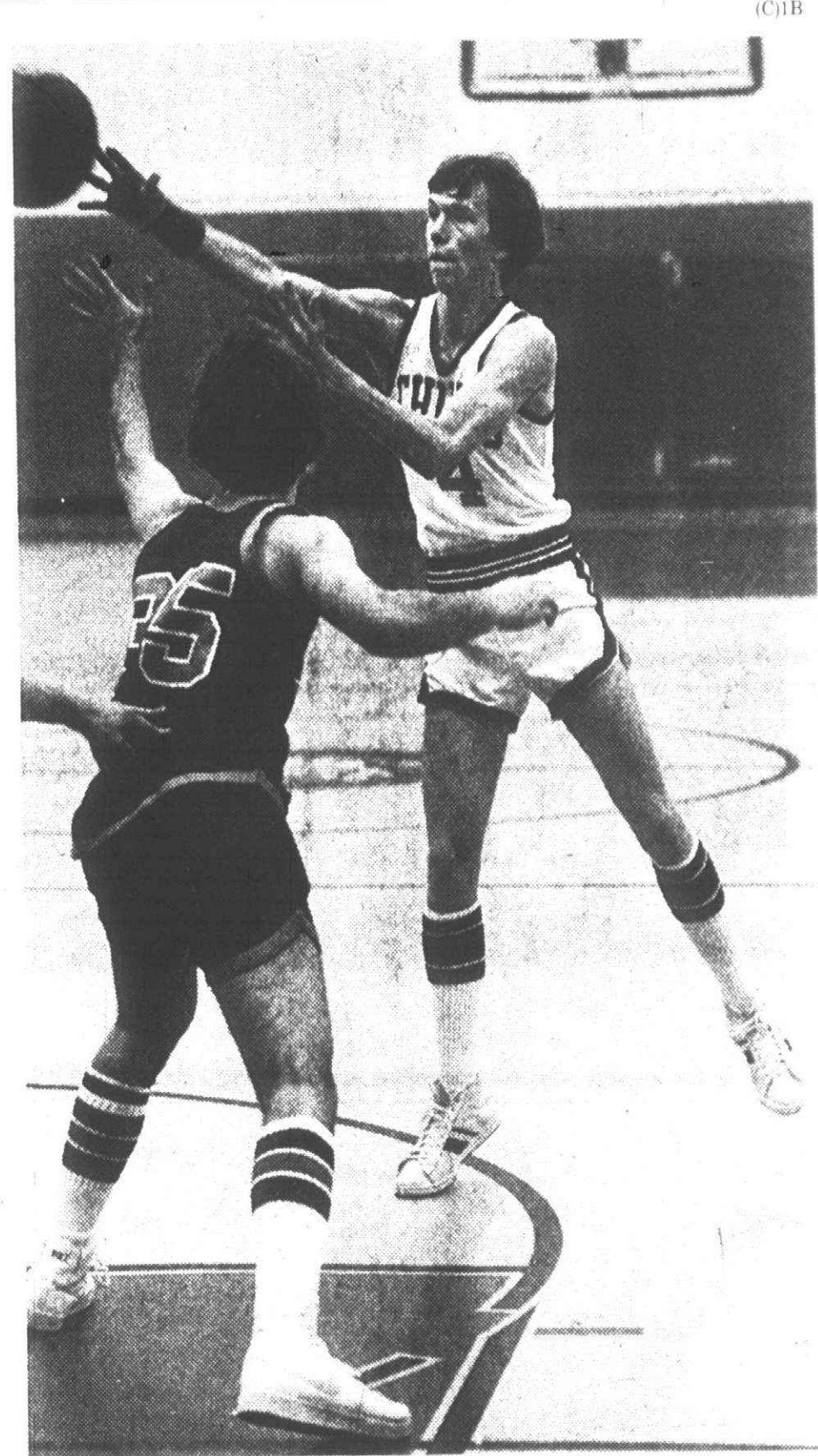

Petersen won both the 100-yard butterfly (54.42) and 100-yard breaststroke (1:03.18). He is defending state Class A champ in both events.

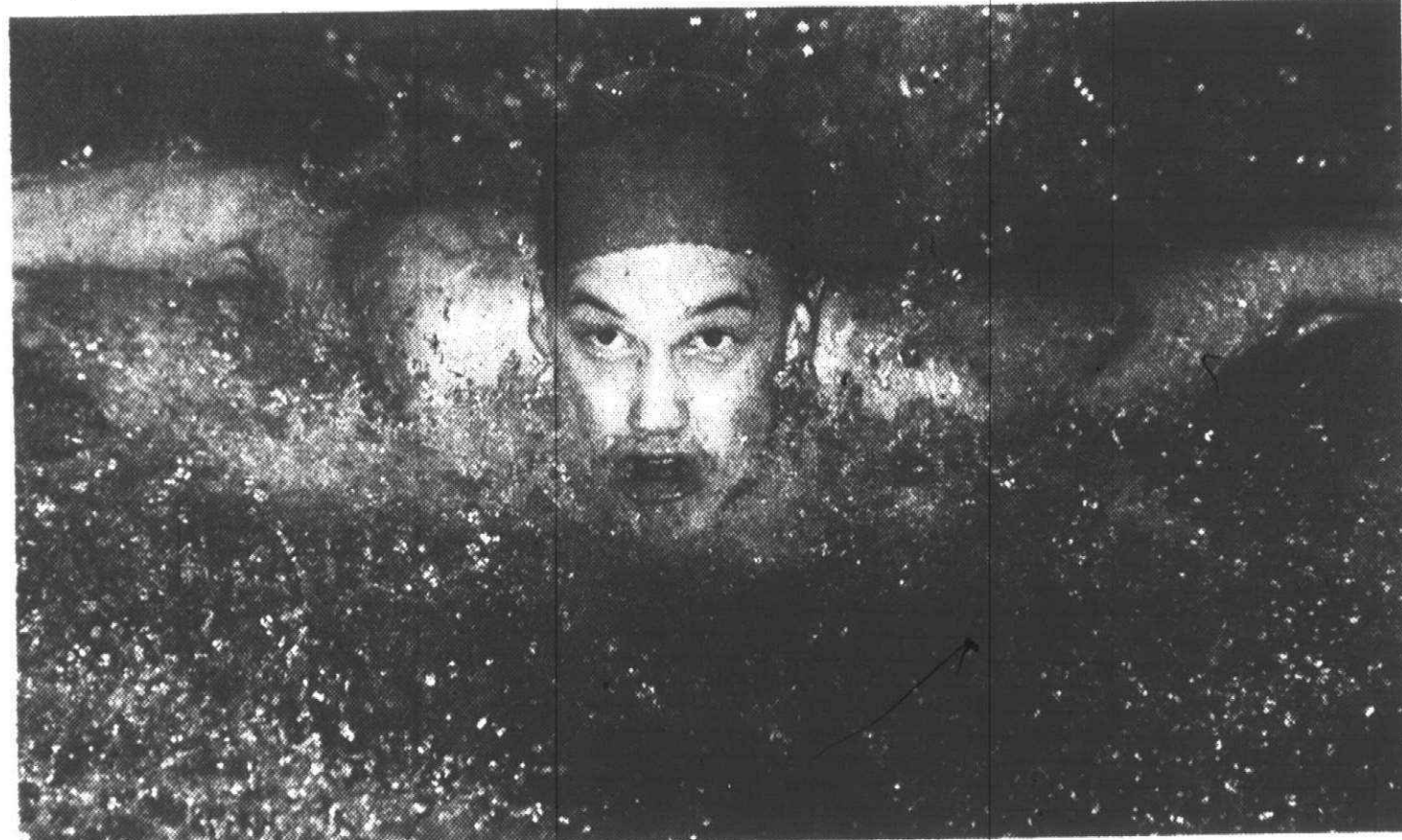

Sophomore Russ Shaffer gained second place finishes in the 200-yard freestyle (1:53.4) and 500-yard freestyle (5:09.0).

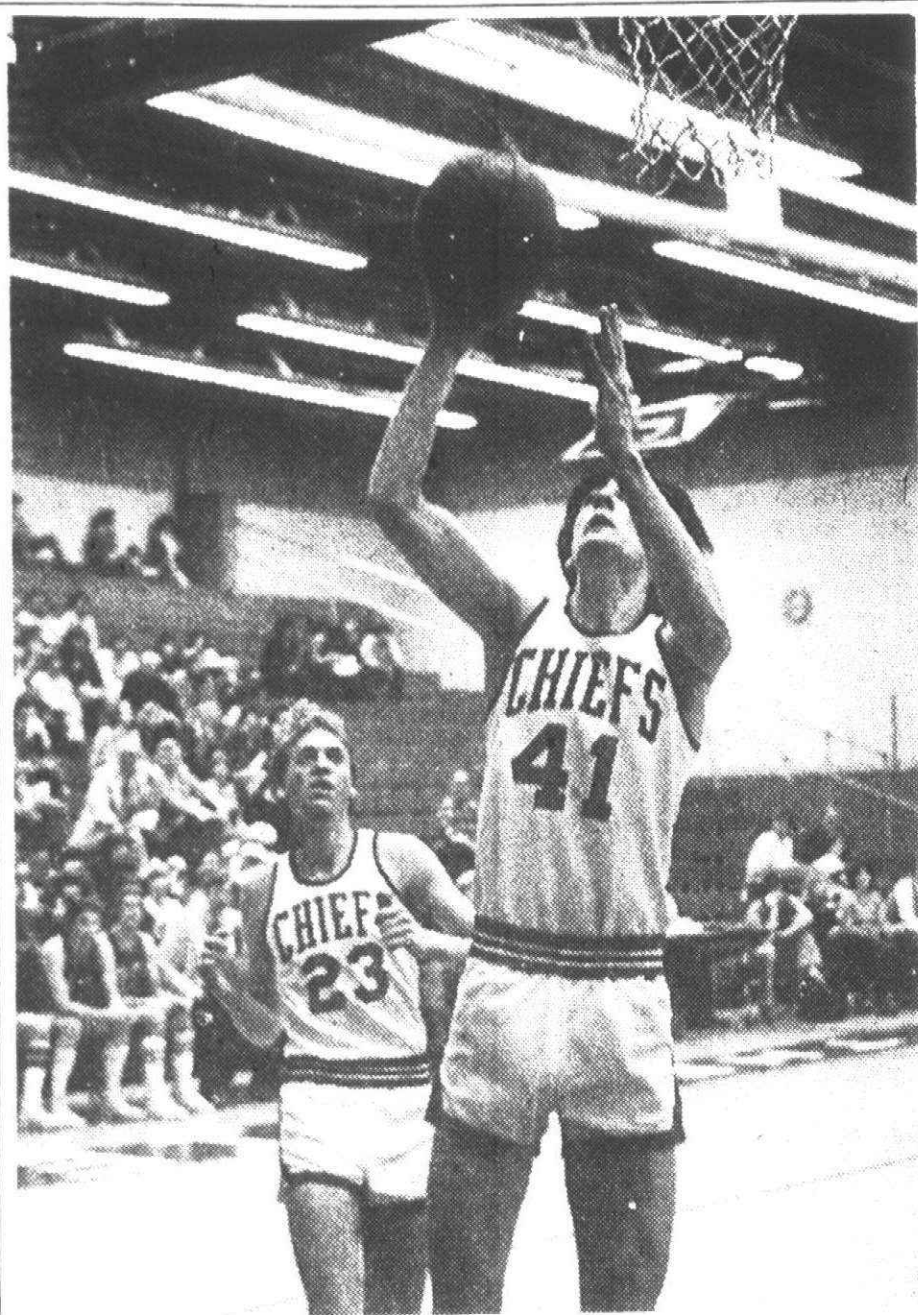

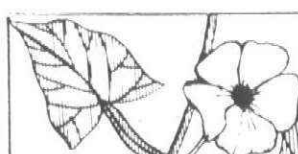

BRICKLEY WAS born in Flint and raised in Detroit.

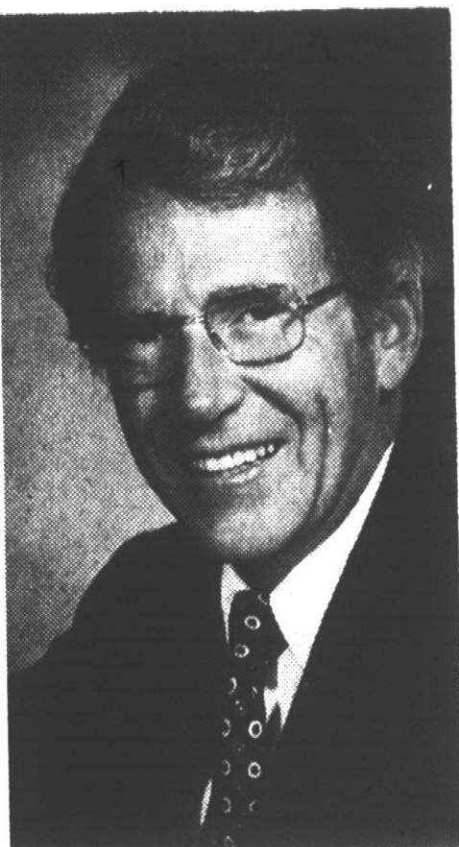
He received his bachelor's and law degrees from the University of Detroit and earned a master's degree in public and administrative law from New York University.

Costly arbitration is avoided in firefighter contract talks

Plymouth Township and its firefighters, represented by Local 1496 of the AFL-CIO, have reached a settlement in employee rules and regulations just short of a formal arbitration in the case.

The agreement was signed by both sides last Wednesday and received unanimous support from the bargaining unit.

The settlement outlines several points of mutual agreement in employee working conditions.

According to Township Clerk Esther Hulsing, the settlement, which in effect withdraws cause for arbitration, saves both sides \$350 for the arbitration filing and at least \$1,000 in lawyers fees for both sides.

Resolved is disagreement over the township's sick leave policy. Under the agreement, firefighters must justify the time off they take because of illness.

Mrs. Hulsing says the township "wanted to tighten up" on this policy because overtime costs in that department have soared.

Overtime accumulates when firefighters must be replaced during absences. The township's cost in overtime once soared passed \$60,000 one year.

Another issue that's covered by the settlement assures the township adequate records of firefighters' places of outside employment. Firefighters must now submit in writing where they are working when not on duty at the stations.

Chuck VanVleck, union spokesman, says the membership still feels that listing one's outside employment is "a violation of our privacy." However, the employees felt "it was not worth" taking it to arbitration.

Both sides are still negotiating a new three-year contract that expired March 30, 1979. Attorneys and negotiators will be meeting with a state-appointed arbitrator Feb. 25 to discuss the new contract. VanVleck says the outside employment issue could be settled to their liking if these negotiations reach an arbitrator.

However, according to the union, the biggest bonus of this agreement reached last week was a clause that establishes the contract has precedent over general employee rules and regulations.

"The main thing we wanted and got was that the contract and Act 78 takes precedent," he says.

Mrs. Hulsing says that the township

established general employee rules and regulations so that there would be some "consistency" in working conditions for both unionized and non-unionized employees.

than my other son," one woman said. "You look forward to having a normal baby and then mourn for the child you never had," another added.

Other children in the household often catch on to the situation and — in their own way — place some added guilt on the mother.

"They have a way to hit. My other son once said — 'Mom, do you think you can spend some time with me today?'"

"It's hard to remember that your child is not the center of the universe," said Lois Bass, a district social worker who coordinates the mothers' monthly meetings.

SENSITIVE TO THEIR concerns, she told the group:

"I think I'm getting the feeling that the demands of your child are so great that you tend to feel you're the only ones who can give."

Daily routines, almost insignificant to most people, take on a special meaning to these women.

"The only time I have to myself is when I'm taking a shower," said Mrs. Bowers. "I usually wait until the water runs cold and then dry my hair."

Planning a trip to the grocery store even takes unusual planning. One woman, whose child is in a wheelchair, said she waits until her husband is home to help with the physical movement.

While most said they've discontinued full-time careers outside the home, one woman mentioned the pleasure of finding some outside contact that's separate from her homelife.

Lisa Walker said she joined the local Jaycettes for just that reason.

"I just wanted to get away a little." When Mrs. Waters found a part-time job, she didn't tell her co-workers about her homelife for six months.

"It was nice for awhile. Sometimes I feel I'm just Barb — the mother of two retarded children."

The series of sessions is designed to lead to specific ideas and activities about career education which teachers can put to use in classrooms across the district, explained Florence Beier, community relations director.

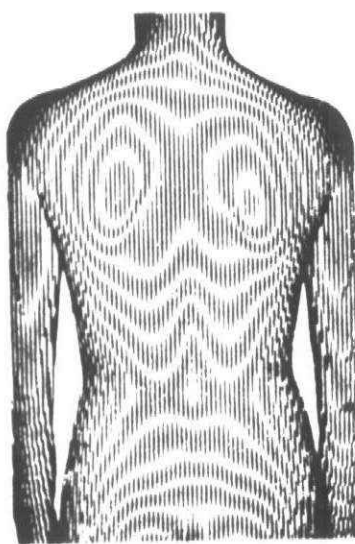
Kicking off the morning session was Dr. Robert Weishan, director of the

Arrogant gigolo lacks loyalty gives a freebie

Paul Schrader, the writer-director who exploded onto the screen with fireworks like "Taxi Driver" and "Blue Collar," has been running through a consignment of duds ever since. These include "Hardcore" and his most recent film, "American Gigolo" (R).

The legacy of Schrader's Dutch Reformation Church (Grand Rapids) upbringing, with its strict moral code and burden of sin and guilt, created an electric current of tension in the earlier films that has fizzled into a mild tingle of voyeurism in "American Gigolo."

Richard Gere is the protagonist, Julian Kay, a luxury-loving stud who turns tricks for a callgirl-callback ring by Nina van Pallandt. Ostensibly, he works as a translator and chauffeur, so he can squire wealthy women visitors around Beverly Hills with an initial bow to propriety.

To help out a friend, he also will occasionally do "fags and kinky sex." And wouldn't you know it? It's one of these admirable good deeds for a friend that becomes his downfall. A woman is murdered with whom he once had sexual relations as requested by her sadomasochistic husband.

WHEN A DETECTIVE, significantly named Sunday, informs Julian he is a suspect in the murder, it appears that the long arm of the law and the Lord are reaching out to catch the sinner, even if it's for the wrong crime.

At this point, there are hints that the film might develop into a taut, if seamy, mystery. No such luck. This is not a "who done it" but a moral mishmash "who should pay for it."

Julian has stepped on too many toes. He's become arrogant. Instead of loyalty to the folks who gave him his start, he wants to freelance on his own. To make matters worse, he has an unprofessional affair with the wife (Lauren Hutton) of a senator, and the senator isn't overjoyed.

Hutton's character looks very classy and chic, but she shows us her down-to-earth honesty by telling Julian she wants to -----, Julian, a person of sensitivity, can only shake his head at such uncouth language.

He shakes his head a lot. The collapse of his world is a puzzle to him. As he sees it, he's only trying to bring pleasure to people. So why are they all down on him?

IMAGINE HIS distress at the thought of jail — a life without shopping at Sotheby, Parke Bernet, driving a Mercedes 450 SL, or dining at Ma Maison. Gere captures the character's inner turmoil as he rages from close-mouthed confidence to silent concern.

In the end, it seems that even the director abandons him, as we sit through one fadeout after another before Schrader can decide on a conclusion.

Ah for the clarity of an old film like "The Postman Always Rings Twice." Lana Turner and John Garfield scorched the screen in a film that was very sensual without any nudity. ("American Gigolo" has nudity but lacks sensuality.) They killed her husband. They were guilty as hell. That's just where they were going, and everyone knew it.

A Question of Taste

Winter's eve supper for 2 — with atmosphere

Restaurants of all sorts will probably be doing turn-away business this Thursday as couples seek suitable settings for romantic dalliances. I suppose this is all well and good except that restaurants seem to me to be less than ideal for the aforementioned purpose.

Presumably, the two lovers wish to be alone, a desire thwarted by even the most discreet waiters and sedate fellow patrons. A more logical choice for true intimacy is one's home, a bastion against the rude intrusions of the world.

Having decided in favor of remaining at home, the lovers are faced with the crucial problem of sustenance. Poets would have you believe that true love robs the afflicted of any appetite for food, one hungers only for the be-

loved. Personally, it's never hurt my appetite a whit.

For others who do not find their various appetites mutually exclusive, I would like to offer a suitable menu for a winter's eve supper for two.

A little atmosphere would not be amiss here: a checkered tablecloth spread on the floor before a roaring fire, a few throw pillows scattered about for purposes of lounging in the fashion of decadent Romans at a feast, Ed singing "My Funny Valentine" in the background and a recording of Ravel's "Bolero" in the wings.

But back to the menu.

BEER AND ONION SOUP or FRENCH ONION SOUP

FRENCH BREAD SPANISH MARINATED SALAD

The first soup listed is an intriguing change from conventional onion soup. It is taken from "The Vegetarian Epicure, Book Two," by Anna Thomas, one of the best, most creative cookbooks I have ever seen.

The beer I use for this is Velvet Cream Porter, a rich, heavy brew which is, unfortunately, available only in Canada. Any dark beer which suits your taste could be substituted. The same beer used in the soup should accompany the meal, served in frosted beer mugs.

Although the Beer and Onion Soup is superb, those with more conservative palates might prefer the French Onion

Soup. It is more traditional, but equally delicious and would be enhanced by the accompaniment of a good cold ale or chilled white wine.

Whichever soup you choose, the cheese used in the preparation should be freshly grated Parmesan. Please, never use pre-grated Parmesan. I'm not sure what they put in those packages and would hate to guess, but it bears no resemblance to the real thing. Buy it in chunk form and either grate it by hand or diced into 1/2-inch cubes and whirl these in a blender. Blender manufacturers don't recommend this use for their machines but I have been doing it for years with no dire consequences.

2 to 3 cloves garlic, minced
3/4 cup butter
2 cups vegetable broth
2 1/2 cups dark beer or stout
1 1/4 cups cream
2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. paprika
Dash of Tabasco sauce
Fresh-ground black pepper to taste
2 to 4 tsp. sugar (depending on the bitterness of beer used)
2 tsp. cider vinegar
4 egg yolks
Optional garnish:
Hot paprika
Toasted croutons and
Grated Parmesan cheese

1/2 tsp. dry mustard
Dash of thyme
Few dashes of white pepper
Salt to taste (1 to 2 tsp.)

Melt the butter or margarine in a large pot. Add the onions and garlic, salting lightly. Cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, until golden brown, at least one hour. Stir in mustard and thyme.

Add remaining ingredients. Cook over low heat, covered, at least 30 minutes. Serve topped with croutons and grated Parmesan or Swiss cheese. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

To make croutons, dice some good firm bread. Sauté in garlic butter. Spread on a baking sheet and bake in a preheated 325 degree oven for 15 minutes. If your soup bowls are oven-proof, ladle the soup into the bowls, sprinkle the croutons on top and cover the croutons with a thick layer of grated cheese. Run briefly under the broiler until just golden brown.

If your bowls are not oven-proof, this last step can be accomplished on the baking sheet. Lightly butter a small area of the sheet and cluster the croutons over the buttered area. Sprinkle with cheese, broil and transfer chunks of this mixture to the bowls.

SPANISH MARINATED SALAD

1/4 cup olive oil
3 tbsp. red wine vinegar
1 small onion, diced
1/4 tsp. oregano
1 tsp. basil
1 clove garlic, minced
Dash salt
1/2 cup sliced stuffed green olives
1 pkg. (9 oz.) frozen artichoke hearts, cooked and drained
1 cup small cauliflowerettes
1 cup sliced mushrooms
1/2 cup thinly sliced carrots

In a medium bowl, stir together the first seven ingredients. Add the olives and vegetables; stir gently to mix well. Cover and refrigerate several hours, stirring occasionally. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

Byrd's Kitchen

A valentine for a terrific lady

Rhele Rhede is a special lady. She is one of those rare people who are warm and caring, and at the same time, straightforward, down-to-earth and easy to trust. She long ago earned my admiration.

Trained as a nurse at Henry Ford Hospital, Rhele has worked at the University of Michigan, Oakland County and Ford Hospitals. Her terrific bedside manner came mostly from a sincere interest in her patients and concern for their recovery.

When she married Dave Lundin, a marketing specialist at General Motors, about three years ago, each of them brought along a child, daughter Deil, who is 9, and son, John, 8. The family was expanded with the birth of Alissa nine months ago.

An excellent cook, Rhele has been filling the family's new house in Bloomfield Hills with some delicious aromas, such as might come from the recipes she shares below.

COLLEEN'S SWEDISH GREEN POTATOES

6 medium large POTATOES, peeled,
boiled and mashed, no salt in water (Idaho potatoes)
1 10-ounce pkg. frozen
chopped spinach, prepared
to package directions and well-drained
1 tsp. Lawry's seasoning salt
1 tsp. regular salt
1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper
1 tsp. chives
(heaping or more if you like)
3/4 cup cream
1 stick butter (don't use margarine)

Prepare potatoes and spinach and mix. Melt butter and add to mixture. Add cream and seasonings and mix well, but don't overdo as potatoes may get gluey. Bake in buttered casserole at 350 degrees for 20 to 30 minutes, until warm and slightly brown on top.

This dish can be made ahead same day and refrigerated, or it can be frozen.

SPINACH FILO TRIANGLES

These make good nibbles for company, freeze

well and are always bringing raves, Rhele says.

1 pkg. (1 lb.) Filo dough
(in freezer section)
1/2 cup butter, melted
Filling:
2 pkgs. (10 oz.) frozen chopped spinach,
thawed and drained
2 cups sour cream
2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. dill weed
Dash of pepper

Squeeze water from spinach and stir together with sour cream, salt, dill weed and pepper. Mix well.

To assemble: Place one sheet filo dough on flat surface. Brush with melted butter. Place another sheet of filo on top. Cut in half lengthwise with kitchen shears and cut the halves lengthwise again, forming four narrow strips. Place 1 tbsp. of filling on end of each strip. Roll strips, flag style, to form triangles.

NOTE: Flag folding: With end of strip toward you, fold the right bottom corner over to the left, creating a pointed end. Then, using that end "triangle," fold upward, triangle over triangle, until the strip of dough is used up and a rolled triangle results.

Place on greased baking sheet, seam side down, or bake in 375 degree oven for 20 to 30 minutes until golden brown.

DEIL'S ITALIAN MEATBALLS

This recipe comes from Rhele's mother and is Italian. It can be made cocktail size for a buffet or egg-size and served as a side dish for spaghetti. Leftovers make superb sandwiches.

1 1/4 lb. ground beef
1 small to medium sized onion,

2 tsp. basil leaves
1/4 tsp. pepper
1/2 cup elbow macaroni
1 small green pepper, chopped
Grated Parmesan cheese, if desired

Wash kidney beans, add 2 cups water, bring to boil and cook 2 minutes. Cover and let stand 1 hour. Place soup bone in Dutch oven or large pot; add remaining 3 cups water; cover tightly and simmer 1 1/2 hours. Add beef and beans and simmer 30 minutes. Drain tomatoes, reserving liquid. Add tomato liquid, cabbage, carrot, onion, garlic, salt, basil and pepper. Cover and simmer 1 1/2 to 2 hours, or until meat is tender. Remove soup bone, cut off any meat and return to soup. Remove marrow from bone and add, if desired. Cut reserved tomatoes in pieces. Add tomatoes, macaroni and green pepper; simmer 15 minutes, or until macaroni is tender. Serve with Parmesan cheese, if desired. 8 servings (approximately 1 1/4 cups each).

finely chopped
1 10-ounce pkg. chopped frozen
spinach, cooked and drained
1 clove garlic
1/2 cup bread crumbs
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1 egg, beaten
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper

Mix all the ingredients together thoroughly. Shape into balls and brown in 3 tbsp. olive oil, cooking slowly. Cover and cook for 20 minutes. Pour off excess fat. The remainder of the pan juices can be used to make gravy.

Barbara adds that there is tea and instant coffee available in the kitchen for the quilters. All they have to do is heat up the kettle.

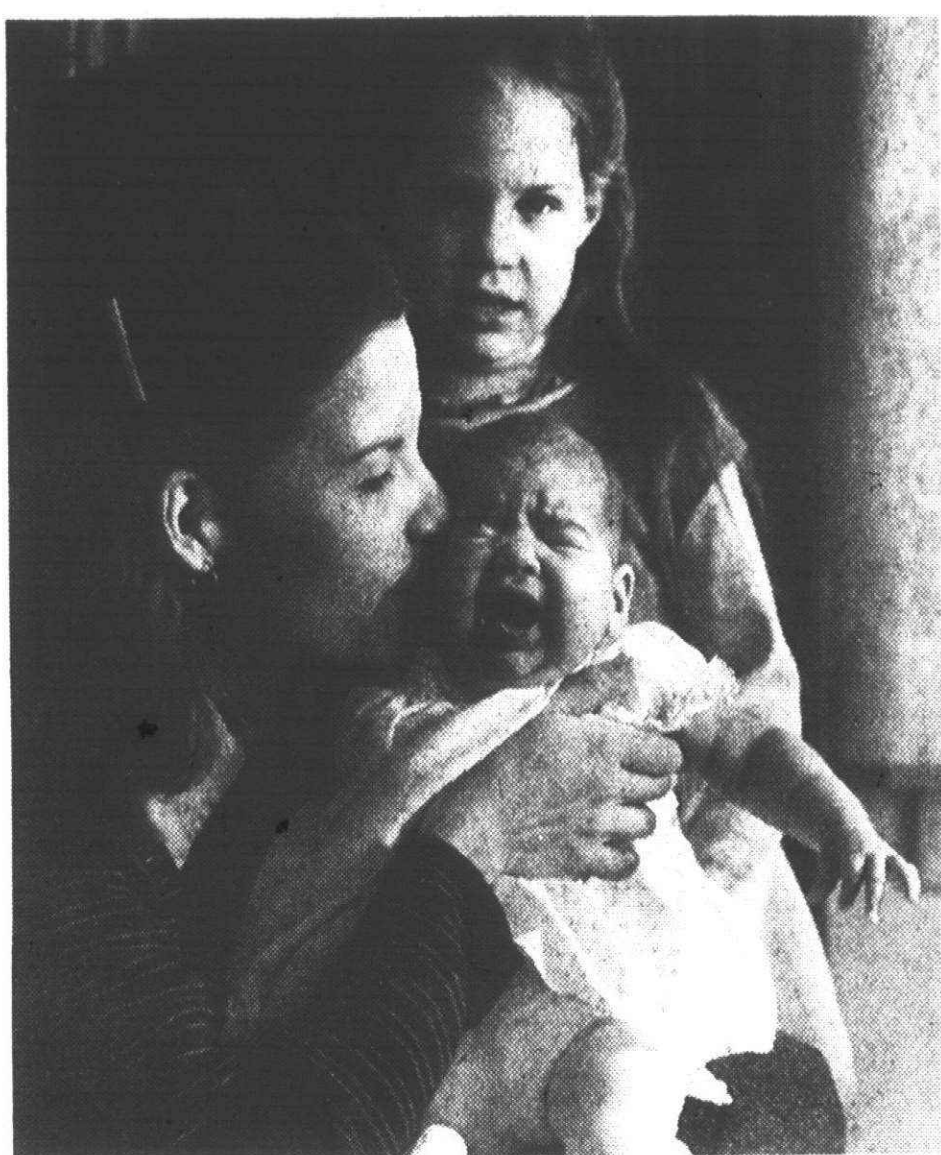

Kiss your Baby Week: search for a symptom

It's "Kiss Your Baby Week" in Michigan and the Plymouth Jaycettes are spreading the word in this area.

Through "Kiss Your Baby," parents are alerted to the unique sign of cystic fibrosis - a salty tasting perspiration. They are urged to kiss their child with special attention, and if the salty taste is present, to have their child checked by a physician.

Early diagnosis and treatment has increased the lifespan of CF children to 16-18 years and many more patients are living into their 20s and beyond. Back in 1955 when the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation was organized, its victims usually died between the ages of 2 and 5 years. The foundation was formed to conduct research on the genetic disease and find a preventative or a control.

The first description of cystic fibrosis was made by Dr. Guido Franconi in Switzerland in 1936. Undoubtedly there had been CF before that time, but it was not recognized as an entity nor given a name.

DURING WORLD WAR II, as anti-

otics were developed, they were used in the treatment of CF to hold down erratic infection. Newly devised methods of treatments - mist tents, postural drainage, physical therapy and improved medications - have allowed patients to lead fairly normal lives, go to school, ride bicycles and go swimming.

Since 1960, it is estimated that 1,905 babies have been born with cystic fibrosis in Michigan. About half of these children are not identified and not receiving the care they need. Many children have been diagnosed as late as 10 or 12 years of age, sometimes after irreparable damage has been done to their lungs.

An effort has started to direct the parents of children with chronic respiratory or gastro-intestinal disease or conditions to a CF center for differential diagnosis at the earliest possible time.

Model demonstration care is offered in the centers. There is no animal model for CF so the patient serves to provide insight into better understanding

of the disease. Patients with other disorders resembling CF also provide physicians with comparative information about all respiratory diseases and approaches to diagnosis and treatment.

JANE BEAUCHAMP, Plymouth Jaycette president, and her committee have distributed flyers to supermarkets and stores. These will be placed in shopping bags this week.

The brochure lists the symptoms of the disease which is inherited and affects the lungs and the digestive system.

Signs of cystic fibrosis are:
Recurrent wheezing.
Persistent coughing with excessive mucus.
Pneumonia more than once.
Excessive appetite with poor weight gain.
Enlargement of fingertips.
Perspiration which leaves salty residue on skin.
Persistent bulky, foul-smelling stools.
Nasal polyps.

It's Jaycette Week in Michigan

Plymouth Jaycettes are joining their counterparts nationwide in celebrating Jaycette Week Feb. 10-16.

High on the local group's agenda for this week is sponsorship of a "Kiss Your Baby" campaign, designed to make people more aware of cystic fibrosis, a disease which can be discovered by a salty taste.

At a regular meeting the group will hear a talk on "Sexuality," by Linda Mills, national chairman for Today's Woman.

The Plymouth group, which was launched in 1962 with 12 members, now has more than 30.

Children are high on the group's priority list of community service projects.

Each year Jaycettes visit Our Lady of Providence, a school for mentally handicapped girls. They have a big party for the girls, with a theme such as "Disco," "Circus" or "Un-Birthday."

In a project called "Cuddles for Christmas," the Plymouth group makes stuffed animals each year as Christmas presents for children at the Plymouth Center for Human Development.

Along with the Jaycees, they help choose and make presentations each year to the outstanding young man and young woman of the community. Selections are made on the basis of involvement in community affairs.

The Jaycettes also have a presentation for school children on safety. It is called "Don't Go With Strangers."

THE OLD are not forgotten. Each year, Plymouth Jaycettes hold a bingo party for senior citizens. It's an event many members look forward to with special fondness, according to Jane Beauchamp, this year's Jaycette president.

To help raise funds for community service projects, the Jaycettes wrap presents for Christmas shoppers and hold an annual talent show.

This past Christmas, gift wrapping brought in \$50 which was donated to

the Ronald McDonald House, a hostel for parents whose children are in Sick Children's Hospital in Detroit.

Belonging to the Jaycettes is not all work, its members point out. Besides regular meetings held the second Tuesday of each month in Pioneer Middle School, there are fun activities, such as mystery trips, a progressive dinners, bowling (women only and couples), square dancing and a once-month "Nite Out."

The group's primary goal is to assist Jaycees, and in this connection members have helped the men with such things as Fourth of July activities (parade, judges, bike judging, etc.), the Plymouth Fall Festival (setting up and serving the beef rib dinner); the Halloween Haunted House; Jelly Week, Burn Awareness (raising money for the National Institute for Burn Medicine); and the Jaycees Inaugural Ball.

MEMBERSHIP in the Jaycettes is open to all women between the ages of 18 and 30. Having a husband in the Jaycees is not a prerequisite. Annual dues are \$12.

The Plymouth Jaycettes' board of directors includes Andy Shoemaker, vice president; Patti Kelly, secretary; Debbie Cummings, treasurer; Pattie Foster, Gan Matthews and Nan Withers, directors; and Vickie Soper, chairman of the board.

A Plymouth member, Paula Joyner, is national vice president for District 4 of the Jaycettes.

Statewide Jaycettes, who number more than 3,000, and 16,000 Jaycee members have donated more than \$1 million to provide better burn care in Michigan over the past five years.

In the past three years, the groups have donated more than \$50,000 to fight Reyes Syndrome, a disease which

threatens the lives of young children.

They have also donated more than \$1 million to Project Concern, an international health care organization, in three years. Of this, \$200 came from the Plymouth chapter, as a result of a "Walk for Mankind."

The state groups have also donated money to fight muscular dystrophy, kidney disease, multiple sclerosis and

juvenile diabetes. They have made donations to the Ronald McDonald House.

Through the state and national organizations, the Plymouth Jaycettes have been able to offer personal development courses in things such as time management, finance, dynamics, leadership dynamics, family life and speech. There is no cost to members for these courses.

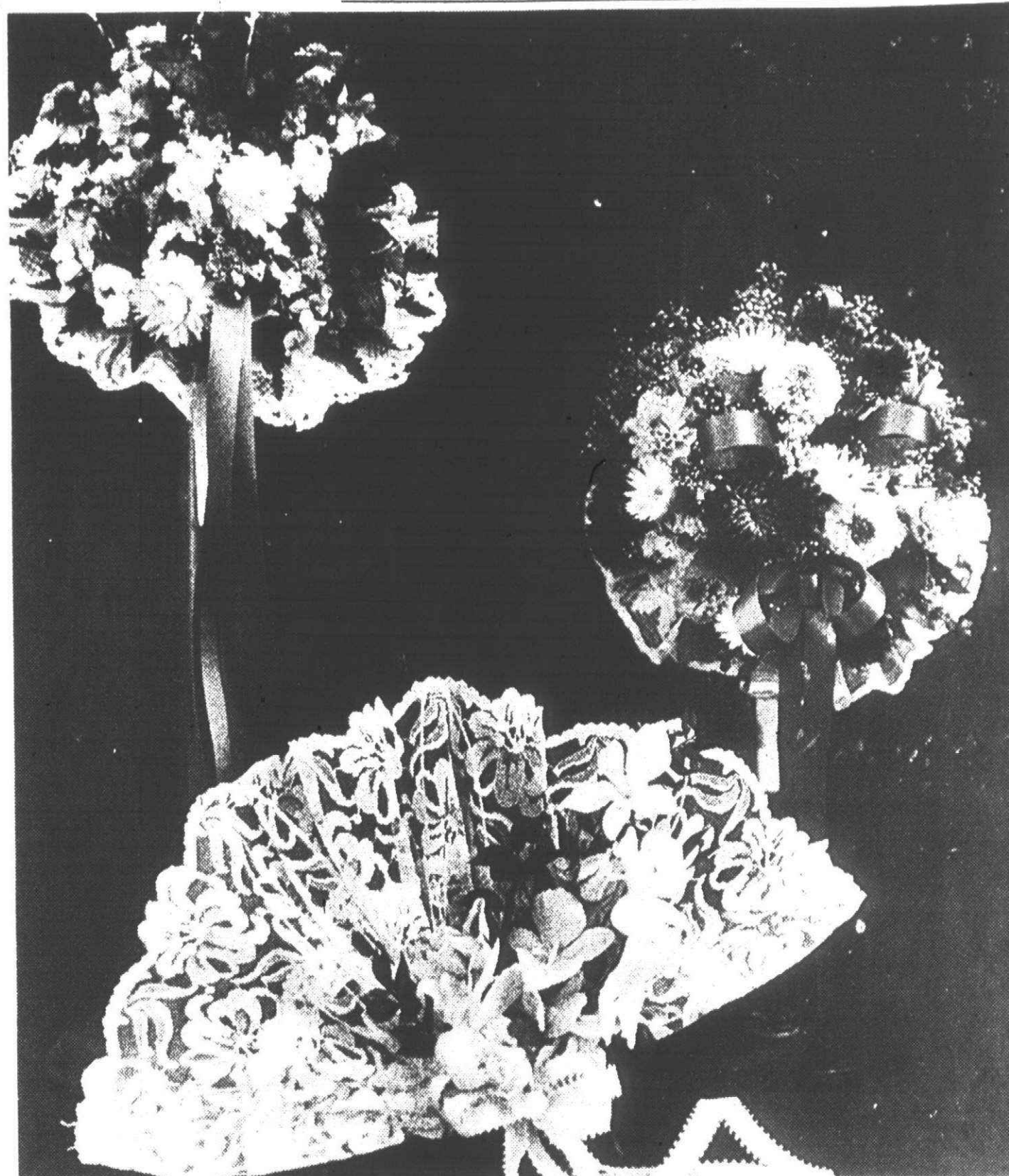

Bible study offered

By the start of the spring semester, Plymouth-Canton high school students will have the chance to put a little religion in their school day.

But it won't be taught at the Centennial Educational Park along with standard academic fare.

Instead, those interested in Bible study will be bussed to Canton's Calvary Assembly of God on Sheldon Road.

The church is opening the study to all students at the park, not just church members, to help today's troubled teens find some answers to everyday life, personal relationships and peer pressure, says Pastor M. Gregory Gentry.

"Hopefully, by bringing them together, they will be able to establish a peer group of their own so that it's more than just burnouts and freaks," he says.

"By learning just the three R's, they are not prepared to deal with the problems of adulthood."

The program will be offered for two hours each week beginning Wednesday, Feb. 13. School officials are cooperating with the program and will release students at different times each week. The schedule will rotate between a first and second hour class dismissal to a fifth and sixth hour class dismissal the following week.

Bill Brown, principal at Plymouth Salem High School, says he is only requiring that the church maintain the schools' attendance policy and that students keep up on their regular classwork.

KENT BUIKEMA, principal at Plymouth

Canton High, says the program will put more pressure on the students since they will be missing certain regular course study that can't be made up — such as guest lecturers and class films.

Nonetheless, the church's request is within the state school code which allows for limited class dismissal for religious study.

Gentry says this provision in the school code is little known and he believes his church is only the second to take advantage of it in Michigan.

However, since he has started work on this Bible study, at least one other area pastor, in Westland, has expressed interest in starting one there during school hours.

Gentry says the course will be taught by himself and Pastor Gordon Mesic, who is the youth and music administrator for the church.

They will focus on the Bible and its interpretation as well as that of the New and Old Testaments. He says it will remain non-denominational and not push the focus of his own Pentecostal leaning.

"We're not looking to build our church. We just feel a responsibility to the community in certain areas and this is one of them. This gives spiritual instruction its proper place in life and its proper recognition."

Gentry says the course is proposed during school hours rather than after school or on Sunday, because he believes more students will participate during school hours.

History under glass

A restaurant is often more than just an eating experience. During a recent trip to Cincinnati, where I tried to eat my way through the city on your behalf, I was reminded of another trip to this area and of a restaurant called the El Greco.

The El Greco is in a Spanish-style building in Southgate, Ky., near Covington. It is across the bridge and within easy access of Cincinnati.

I visited the restaurant during a spring meeting of the Midwest Travel Writers in the fall of 1977. The name brings three instant visual memories, two good and one bad.

We visited the restaurant as a prelude to a visit to the Beverly Hills Supper Club, which burned down a short time later.

To this day, I cannot enter a room where tables are jammed in facing the stage without thinking of the people who died there during that fire. That memory is very personal. We were sitting in a position in one of the large rooms where we would probably not have survived that fire.

That's the bad memory. It has nothing to connect it with El Greco except that we visited both on the same night. My memories of El Greco are all good.

TO GET A FEELING for this place, you need only read the blurb they print on their menu, all in lower case: "the italian restaurant • with the spanish name • hosted by the jewish couple • with the greek partner • featuring american steaks • french onion soup • ecuadorian ceviche • and swiss fondue."

The food was good, but the key word in that blurb is Ecuadorian. Around a corner, in one of those Spanish rooms, was a collection of pre-Columbian artifacts that would make a museum curator suck in his breath.

There were cards inside the glass case to show that the collection had been recorded by the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C., but the most prized part of the experience for me was the story that went with it.

Restaurant owner Jimmy Bernstein once served with the Peace Corp in Ecuador. His job was to help mountain villagers make their living at home, so that they would stop streaming into the cities where they did not do well.

While plowing a field one day, he uncovered some ancient artifacts. According to Bernstein, he made a deal with the Ecuadorian government whereby he would unearth, restore and collect the artifacts. If they would allow him to take them home to the United States, he would contract to return them to Ecuador if a museum was built there within 10 years.

THE ECUADORIAN government, which normally would not allow such treasures out of the country, agreed. The 10 years are up and Bernstein still has the artifacts, although he said in 1977 that he would still return the treasures if a museum were built for them.

In the meantime, he decided to bring them to El Greco so that he could enjoy them. "I'm always at the restaurant and I'm seldom at home. This way I can see them often, and diners can see them too."

So many memories from one brief visit to a restaurant while on the road. I'll probably forget the food and the ambience of the restaurant, and eventually I will forget the fire at the Beverly Hills Supper Club, but not that collection of pre-Columbian artifacts, discovered so unexpectedly in an out-of-the-way restaurant in northern Kentucky.

Cincinnati cuisine cruisin'

Scene One is Mike Fink's riverboat restaurant on the Kentucky side of the Ohio River, not far from the mouth of the Licking River.

This is where Cincinnati was born and what gave the town its first name: Losantiville. It's a mixture of French and Latin that loosely means the town opposite the mouth of the Licking.

Scene Two is the Rookwood Pottery restaurant on Mount Adams, one of the seven hills of the city. Here, a daughter of one of Cincinnati's wealthy families established a pottery in the late 19th century. Here, narrow restored houses climb with old-fashioned elegance up the hill overlooking the city center.

Scene Three is the Maisonette on East Sixth Street, in the heart of downtown, where the Comisar family has consistently earned five-star ratings in the "Mobil Guide" for their traditional French food. The Maisonette is more than just an excellent restaurant. It is a culmination of the European immigrant dream combined with American know-how in an almost-southern setting.

These are only three of many eating places you can choose if you stay in the slow lane on your way down Interstate 75. They run the taste and price range from hamburgers through raw oysters, to chocolate mousse, but they all say Cincinnati.

MIKE FINK'S is at the foot of Greenup Street in Covington, next to the suspension bridge that curves across the Ohio River from downtown Cincinnati. Cab fare, including 50 cents for the bridge, is roughly \$3 from the Greater Cincinnati Convention and Visitor's Bureau in the heart of downtown.

The paddle-wheeler restaurant was built in 1936 to tow coal and later oil barges, but it has the same romantic look as any Mississippi riverboat. The view is across the river to the skyline of Cincinnati.

The first thing you will see inside the door is the raw bar where a full-time waiter serves oysters, clams, crab legs, snow and stone crabs, shrimps and other fresh seafood by the piece.

The special dinner of the day runs from \$7 to \$10 and the menu ranges from the usual fish and meat dishes found in American restaurants. We chose to concentrate on the seafood, so we ordered a Caesar salad and ate our main protein from the raw bar. It cost 60 cents for a shrimp, about \$3 for a king crab leg.

From here, you are close to Covington, city of churches, and just across the bridge from the tourist highlights of downtown Cincinnati. I recommend that you stop at the tourist bureau for information and walk through the open-side skywalk that runs for several blocks above the main street.

THE SKYWALK starts at Stouffers Cincinnati Towers and hits the Terrace Hilton Hotel as well as the elegant old Netherland Hilton. It's a decent shopping stretch and gives easy access to two other highly rated restaurants: Piggy's and the Gourmet.

It also gives access to Sixth Street and the Maisonette. This restaurant is marked by a simple awning, and an entrance way that gives you an immediate view into three rooms of diners eating happily, if expensively, under the guidance of the Comisar family.

Manager Michael E. Comisar is the third-generation Comisar to bring the family philosophy to the Maisonette: "Pay attention to every small detail and the rest will follow." Michael's grandfather came from Russia with his two brothers during the Depression and founded one of the finest restaurant families of America.

The Comisars run four completely different kinds of restaurants here: The Golden Lamb in Lebanon is the oldest inn in Ohio, and it retains its early American flavor. Chester's Road House, which doesn't take reservations, is a stained-glass-and-music place that particularly appeals to young adults.

La Normaadie, downstairs from the Maisonette, is a peanuts-on-the-floor room of steak and duck legs; the sauces come from the Maisonette kitchen upstairs, which is a bonus.

The Maisonette is a no-fooling-around, first-class traditional French restaurant which pays impeccable attention to the details of the table but tries to make the setting comfortable for everybody.

Our dinner, which averaged \$33 a person, included a pate; a filet of brill fish flown fresh from Paris and cooked with a mouseline of seafood and truffles, wrapped in pastry and served with a white wine sauce; a bib lettuce salad served with the house dressing; and a chocolate mousse a desert-lover would die for.

That price included a champagne cocktail and a bottle of the house wine. Food portions are medium-sized.

If you choose to eat in this downtown area, be sure to visit the historic old city hall with its stained glass windows, St. Peter in Chains Cathedral and the Isaac M. Wise Temple, all within walking distance and located close to one another.

Or go past Fountain Square to the Taft Museum, which has a remarkable collection of paintings in the setting of an old mansion.

AND THEN THERE'S hamburgers at the Rookwood Pottery. They range from basic to with bacon and cheese and can be ordered with a scrumptious spinach salad and a drink.

The old beam and plaster building sits on top of Mount Adams, at the end of winding streets that make you think of San Francisco.

Across the parking lot, under the same management, is the Celestial restaurant, "gourmet and good."

Half a mile down the road is the Cincinnati Museum of Art, the Museum of Natural History, the Krohn Conservatory and the Cincinnati Playhouse.

Other restaurants in Cincinnati which were recommended by local people in and out of the food business are: Mecklinberg's, Selestat and Edwards.

It's simple and elegant,
and FDR called it home

Thirty years have passed since Franklin D. Roosevelt made his last trip to Warm Springs, Ga.

Since then, almost three million visitors have toured his Little White House since it became a national shrine. It is a house removed from the cluttered, complex world around it, elegant and tranquil.

Roosevelt treasured the relaxation, the peaceful vistas where he could drive his hand-operated car

alone, look across the Georgia countryside and ponder the monumental decisions to be made regarding his country and his world.

Three decades have brought little change to the place. A museum housing many mementoes of his years as president has been added and a 12-minute movie of FDR in Georgia is shown.

Roosevelt lived in sumptuous residences — the family home at Hyde Park, N.Y., and the White House — but in building for himself the kind of home he wanted, he built a very modest place. When completed in 1932, his Warm Springs cottage cost \$8,738.14.

THE HOUSE is set on the slopes of Pine Mountain, a location selected by FDR during his early stays in Warm Springs. Even before there was a house on the property, he used the area for picnics.

Visitors have freedom in touring the home, the museum, and the Walk of States (a collection of stones and flags). There are no guided tours. Tourists stroll leisurely through the rooms. As they enter various areas, a recorded commentary is activated and significant objects are described.

Elizabeth Shoumatoff's unfinished portrait of FDR can be seen in its original setting. The artist was painting Roosevelt at the time he was stricken.

On view also is the 1938 Ford convertible with its specially fitted hand controls, the guest house where many notables were entertained, the servants' quarters, the unusual bump gate, the old Warm Springs stage coach, and the memorial fountain.

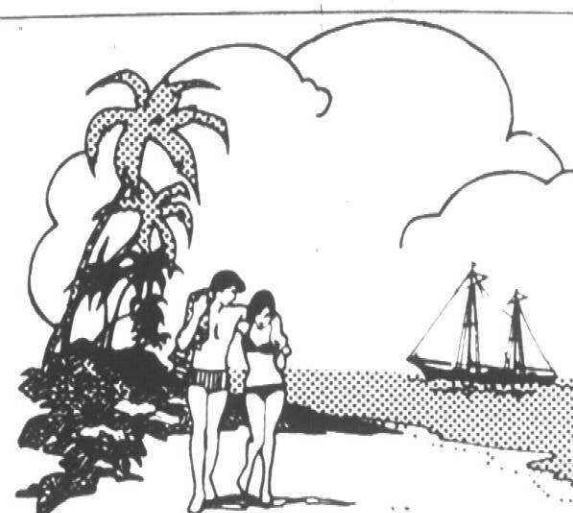
Each year around the anniversary of the President's death, people close to him recount their memories during commemorative ceremonies at the Little White House. James Roosevelt, FDR's eldest son, will be the speaker for this year's service April 12.

Roosevelt's Little White House, 70 miles from Atlanta on U.S. 27 A and Georgia 85W, is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. There is ample parking space, picnic areas, a snack bar, rest rooms, and a gift shop.

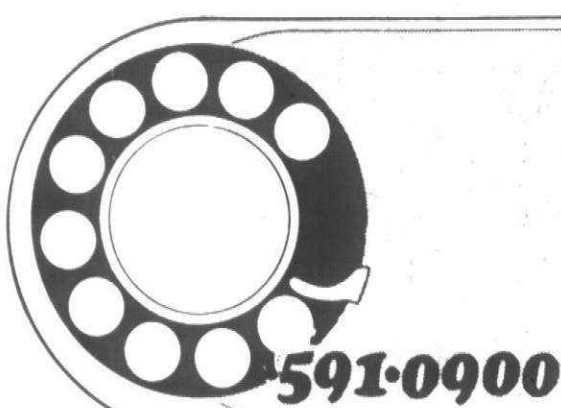

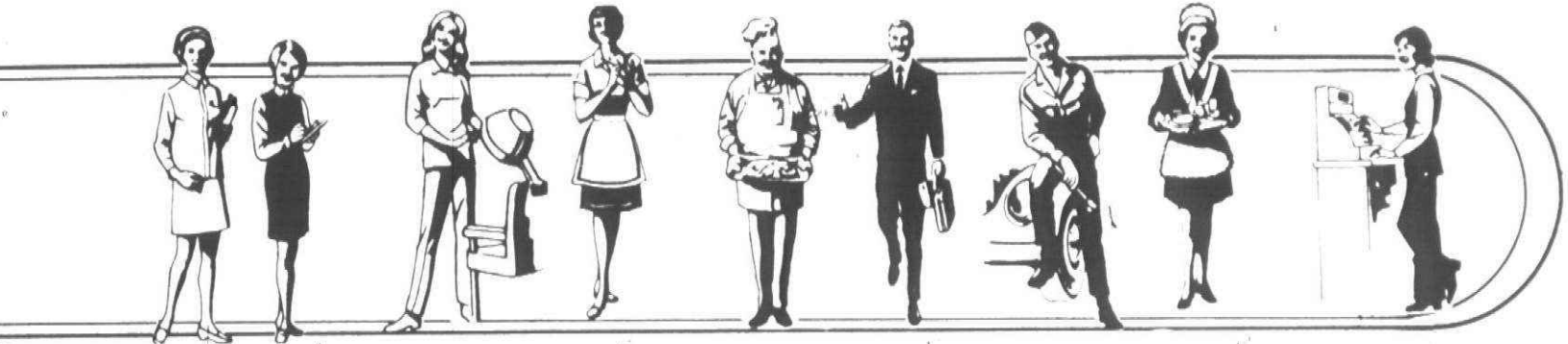

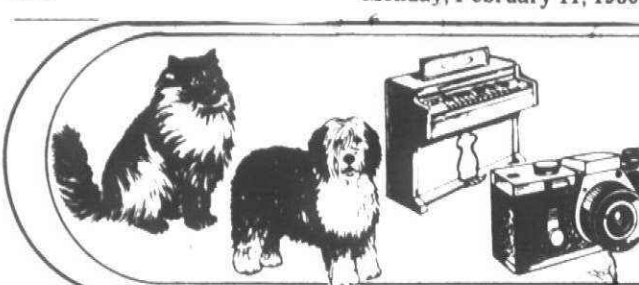

Poor gas mileage wastes good money

If you're not keeping track of your gasoline mileage, you're probably in a minority. Everyone has become gasoline conscience. Or so it would seem.

The truth, though, is that many drivers don't know what kind of mileage their car is delivering. So when mileage falls off through a lack of maintenance, they're only vaguely aware of it.

A drop in fuel economy could be a warning of certain mechanical malfunctions, and it could cost you as much as \$240 per year in increased fuel costs, according to the Consumer Automotive Advisory Council of Superior Muffler Centers, Inc.

Drivers could be adding 25 percent to their gasoline bills without even realizing it. The figure is based on a fullsize car getting 15 miles per gallon and driven 12,000 miles per year.

For instance:
• If the car needs a tuneup, it could be using as much as 11 percent more gasoline than it should. At \$1.20 per gallon, that waste amounts to \$8.80 per month.

• If tires are eight pounds underinflated, rolling resistance increases gasoline consumption by five percent. The cost: \$4.00 per month.

• If the front wheels are one-quarter inch out of alignment, the increased rolling resistance costs another two percent in fuel mileage, or \$1.60 per month.

• If the cooling system thermostat is stuck in the open position, causing the engine to run cool, engine efficiency could be reduced by another seven percent, costing \$5.45 extra per month in gasoline.

Add it all up and you get 25 percent and \$20 per month, or \$240 per year. Of course, if you're losing more mileage through poor driving habits, your unnecessary cost will be even higher.

While the totals here are intended to emphasize the need for preventative maintenance to save fuel, there are other equally important factors to consider. An untuned engine is less dependable, often hard to start. And it may be polluting the air.

Further, improperly aligned wheels affect a car's handling characteristics. This, combined with underinflation, can accelerate tire wear by 25 percent. That's like throwing away one new tire in four.

To save the maximum amount of gasoline (and money), you must not drive any faster than the speed limit.

Every five miles per hour you press beyond the 55 mph speed limit is costing you about one mile per gallon in fuel economy. If you average 15 miles per gallon, you pay more than six percent for driving 60 instead of 55.

The penalty is worse the faster you drive.

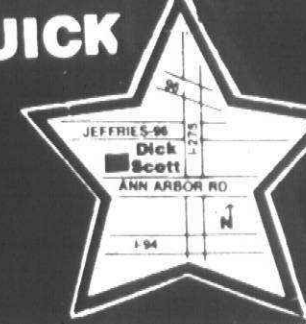
