Bi-Products gives up on Canton site

In spite of a 90-day ultimatum to find a site for sludge composting or lose its contract with the city of Detroit, Bi-Products of Michigan has apparently given up on its bid to set up shop at a Canton location.

Bi-Products representative Dennis Talbert, however, said the firm is still considering other sites. He would not reveal where the proposed sites are situated.

Although Talbert said the company can still meet its contractual obligations with Detroit, George Matish of the city's legal staff seemed less certain.

According to Matish, Detroit City Council members were informed Tuesday that the legal department had sent a letter notifying Bi-Products that its contract would be considered terminated if no sludge composting site was found within 90 days.

Bi-Products was hired by Detroit following the city's court directive to seek alternate methods of disposing of sludge from its sewage treatment plant.

The company won a bid for contractual services for Detroit about two years ago. Bi-Product's plan was to take sludge from the plant and, through composting, convert it to a soil additive. The soil additive would have been restricted in use because it would contain chemical and heavy metal residue as a result of industrial waste treated by the sewage plant.

BI-PRODUCTS had hoped Canton would allow the company to compost the sludge on a site just north of Michigan Avenue.

Although Township Board members appeared receptive to the idea at first, public opposition and further research

concerning potential hazards created by the finished soil additive caused them to balk at approving a site for the project.

Talbert said many communities raise such opposition to the sludge composting project.

The spokesman said Bi-Products had obtained site approval from a community, but would not name which municipality is involved. He said the locations of prospective sites would be announced at a later date.

Matish said Bi-Product's contract with the city was to have extended through 1981 and would have cost a total of \$12 million. He said he did not know how much has already been paid to the company.

According to Matish, the company did perform at least one service for the city — that of mixing sludge with a neutralizing agent (such as lime or ash) and transporting it to a landfill when the sludge level at the sewage treatment plant grew too high.

"It was something that needed to be done," he said.

Some of the sludge which Bi-Products disposed of in this manner last spring was taken to the Woodland Meadows landfill in Canton, which angered township residents and officials.

Although Detroit appears ready to break with Bi-Products, Matish said the city hasn't "given up on the composting idea."

Bi-Products hasn't given up on the sludge composting idea either, although it has apparently given up on Canton.

Canton Supervisor Noel Culbert commented on the announcement saying, "I just wish they (Bi-Products) had told us we weren't being considered anymore. It would have saved us about \$2,000 in attorney and litigation costs."

State to hear agency arguments

Detroit's request to establish its own funding agency for senior citizen services will be scrutinized at a public hearing Friday called by the Michigan Commission on Services to the Aging.

The hearing, to be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the community arts auditorium at the Michigan State Fairgrounds, allows both those who support or oppose the proposed split with the existing Detroit-Wayne County Area Agency on Aging (AAA) to voice their opinions.

Expected to attend the meeting is Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara, who has proposed that suburban com-

munities break from the AAA in order to form their own funding agency if Detroit succeeds in splitting off.

According to a Wayne County spokesman, the county would also attempt to establish a separate area agency if Detroit succeeds.

A county representative, as well as representatives from Detroit and senior citizen groups, are also expected to testify at the hearing.

Presently, Detroit receives 70 percent of all funds distributed through the AAA, with the rest of the county getting the remainder.

According to a county spokesman, Julius Otten, chairman of the AAA board, said the agency receives more

than \$7 million per year, with \$500,000 spent to cover the cost of 31 employees and administration costs.

Otten was unavailable for comment. MacNamara, during a meeting with suburban community representatives called to discuss an out-county agency, said he believed the agency spent closer to \$1 million — the maximum allowed by law — on administrative costs. He said he could not get exact figures from Fred Ferris, director of the AAA.

At a meeting last week of the Wayne County Human Resources Committee, which has been studying Detroit's effort to split from the AAA, members

condemned the move and said they would try to prevent it.

The decision to allow the separation of Detroit, suburban communities or the county from the present AAA would be made by the State Office on Aging. Peter Kok, director of that office, could not be reached for comment on when a decision would be reached.

In order to obtain direct federal funding with area agency status, a community has to have a population of 100,000 persons. Detroit and Livonia both fall into that category.

If the cities succeed in starting with their own agencies, the present AAA would have to dissolve for lack of communities to fund.

CEP vandalism called better than reported

"Vandalism at the Park isn't as bad as the press made it out to be, but not as good as you and I would like it to be."

With that statement, Kent Buikema, principal of Plymouth Canton High, began a presentation Monday night to the school board on vandalism at the

Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

Buikema and Bill Brown, principal of Plymouth Salem High, were asked to brief the board on vandalism at the high schools after trustees read a report on destructive acts in the rest-

rooms in the Feb. 7 edition of the Observer.

While admitting vandalism is a serious problem at the CEP, Buikema cited the following differences of opinion with the earlier news report:

- Half the restrooms have not been closed since the start of the school

year. One restroom may be locked for cleaning at various times, and sometimes maintenance forgets to unlock it in the morning.

- Toilet paper had not been removed as a reaction to students setting bon fires in the restrooms. Instead, a very small amount of paper is placed in dispensers and maintenance persons refill the dispensers five to six times a day.
- The bon fires are set using individual sheets of tissue, not paper rolls as reported.

MOST OF THE vandalism seems to occur in the restrooms, noted Brown.

Four weeks ago after a home basketball game with Trenton, Brown said, some students from Trenton went to an upstairs restroom and kicked out the wall petitions.

The schools also have problems during the noon hour when five different groups are scheduled into the cafeteria for lunch, said Brown.

Students have a 40-minute lunch hour, normally eat in 15 minutes, and then leave the cafeteria area to make room for other incoming students.

"It's a problem once they leave the cafeteria," said Brown. "We keep them out of the academic areas but we are in dire straits trying to police all areas. It doesn't take long to kick in a towel dispenser or start a fire. We just can't police every area with a body."

When students are caught committing vandalism they are suspended and asked to pay for damages, explained Brown. Buikema added that state law allows the schools to ask parents to pay for damage caused by vandalism, up to

\$1,000. "But we have to catch them first."

Brown added: "We always deal with that special element in our schools that want to tear up something. But the after school program is another problem, and Canton High is hit here. People are coming in for night programs four times a week until 10 p.m. Some coming at night seem to tear up our facilities just for kicks."

Buikema said one of the problems is that there is not enough adult supervision assigned during the night programs. Most of the time there is one security guard assigned at night for both high schools.

"Part of our problem too is one of numbers," added Buikema. "There are far more students out there than what

Transformers' placement charges up Canton board

A Detroit Edison drive to place 1,200-pound metal boxes in the front yards of residential areas has been blocked by the Canton board in the name of aesthetics.

Board members emphatically told Edison representatives Tuesday night that a company goal to curb maintenance costs will not take the form of front-yard utilities in Canton Township.

Bob Kelley, manager of Detroit Edison's Wayne division, said a new policy to locate utilities in the front yards of new subdivisions was implemented by his company about one year ago.

Kelley said the policy was adopted in order to improve access to underground cables and above-ground electric transformers — the 1,200-pound metal boxes which are now scattered

throughout backyards of Canton subdivisions.

EDISON HAS already constructed front-yard utilities in such near-by neighborhoods as Trailwood subdivision in Plymouth Township. But a Canton ordinance requires the location of electric utilities at the rear of lots — a stipulation which Kelley asked the board to change.

He said Edison workers must dig trenches along the rear property line in order to repair cables located in backyards. Landscaping is often damaged, and fences occasionally must come down. Poor access to backyard transformers often leads to more property damage, he said.

Under Edison's proposal, underground cables would be located in a 12-

foot easement immediately behind front-yard sidewalks. A transformer, measuring 30-by-24 inches, would be located approximately 25 feet from the street in the front yards of every eighth home.

Canton board members shot down the proposal when they unanimously voted to deny Edison's request for a change in the subdivision ordinance.

"In this community, we have fights about who will get street lights in the front of their houses," said Trustee Robert Greenstein. "It seems a builder would have a terrible job selling a lot with 1,200-pound thing in the front yard."

Greenstein also noted that driving cars across front lawns is "one of the fun things to do" in Canton Township. "What if one of these vandals decided to use your transformer as a target?" he asked.

Kelley admitted that a vehicle impact could sever cables and blow fuses. But he insisted that no one would be electrocuted in such a collision.

Despite the township board's refusal to change the Canton ordinance, one new subdivision will be built with front-yard utilities.

Developer Richard Lewiston said Embassy Square near Saltz between Sheldon and Canton Center was planned to accommodate front-yard utilities after Detroit Edison stated its new policy.

"We have no alternative now but to provide front-yard services," Lewiston said.

Kelley said Detroit Edison officials were unaware of Canton's ordinance when they told Lewiston that front-yard utilities would be required.

"We share in that guilt," said township Clerk John Flodin. "We approved the plat, and we missed it here."

FRANK E. HENDERSON

Funeral services were held recently for Mr. Henderson, 83, of Ann Arbor, in Schrader Funeral Home, Plymouth, with burial in Riverside Cemetery. Officiating was the Rev. Fr. Robert S. Shank, Jr. A memorial service was held by the Knights of Pythias at Schrader's. Memorial contributions may be made to St. John Episcopal Church of Plymouth, to the Plymouth Salvation Army, or to the Plymouth Rotary Foundation.

Mr. Henderson, who died Feb. 9 at St. Joseph Hospital in Ann Arbor, was a life-long resident of Plymouth until his retirement when he moved to Ann Arbor. He was mayor of the city of Plymouth in 1948 and was a member of the Plymouth City Commission from 1947-49. He started the Plymouth Plating Works at Farmer and Amelia streets in 1923 and was in partnership with Henry and Gerald Hondorp until their

deaths. He sold the company to a couple of employees when he retired in 1975. He was a member of the Knights of Pythias, serving as grand chancellor for the state in 1953-54; was a member of the Salvation Army Board of Advisors since 1948, chairman of the board for several years until 1968, was made a life member, and was instrumental in establishing the present Salvation Army Citadel in Plymouth. Mr. Henderson also was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Plymouth Rock No. 47, 2F&AM, for more than 50 years; was a member of the Plymouth Rotary Club since 1945, serving as past president and as district governor of Rotary District 640 in 1957-58, and was a designated Paul Harris Fellow; and was a member of the Plymouth Millard Band many years ago.

He is survived by wife Alyce Ferne Murray and several nieces and nephews.

Board approves 3-year contract with district's cafeteria

A contract for cafeteria employees was approved Monday night by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The agreement calls for a 9 percent pay increase the first year of the contract, retroactive to July 1, 1979, and an 8 percent increase the second and third years.

Cafeteria employees will receive dental insurance starting in April 1980 and get an improvement in that coverage starting the second year of the contract.

In the second year the clothing allowance will be raised by \$5.

The district now has signed contracts with unionized administrators, custodians, educational aides and cafeteria workers. Union employees working without contracts are secretaries, teachers and transportation.

In other action, the board voted to table until the first meeting in April an administrative request to replace 12 buses in the district's fleet.

The motion to table was made by

Carol Davis who argued that the purchase shouldn't be made until the board knows if the bond issue will be approved.

The bus purchase will be financed by the bond issue if voters approve it. Otherwise the funds will come from the operational budget.

The motion to table passed 4-3. Voting against tabling because they wanted to discuss the issue were Steve Harper, Flossie Tonda and Tom Yack.

Davis said she didn't want the bus purchase to be financed with operational funds until the board knew what the instructional needs would be for the coming year.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent of business, said the buses needed to be replaced to keep 12,000 students from not waiting any longer for a bus than they are now.

Hoedel stressed the request was only to buy replacements, not for any additional buses. The district's replacement schedule calls for the purchase of 10-12

buses each year for the next seven years, he added. If the purchase is not made, the schedule will be drastically disrupted, he said.

Later in the meeting trustee Steve Harper expressed disappointment that the bus purchase request was tabled without a chance for discussion.

"I have some questions about the level of this expenditure and about cost-benefit. But I am disturbed that we appear to be going against our own objectives. What we are doing now (by tabling) is what has forced us toward a \$14 million bond issue — ignoring what needs to be done."

Crash critically injures woman from Plymouth

A Plymouth woman was listed in critical condition at St. Mary Hospital, Livonia, early this week following a car accident at Sheldon and Ann Arbor roads Saturday afternoon.

Helen Straka, 57, remained in the hospital's intensive care unit with internal injuries, according to hospital officials.

According to Wayne County Sheriffs, Mrs. Straka's car was struck at 3 p.m. Feb. 9, when she failed to yield to oncoming traffic while turning north onto Sheldon Road.

The driver of the other car, David Henning, 18, of Plymouth, was not injured. There were no passengers in either car.

Mrs. Straka was taken to the hospital by a Plymouth Township rescue squad. It took several minutes to reach her in the front seat of her car as both car doors were jammed by the impact. She was found unconscious.

In a related accident, a city of Plymouth police car was also struck by another car on Ann Arbor Road while Lt. Carl Berry, the driver, was on his way to the scene of the accident at Sheldon and Ann Arbor roads.

While driving west on Ann Arbor Road toward Sheldon, he was struck by a car driven by Jerome Miller Jr., 21, of Plymouth. Miller was ticketed by Wayne County Sheriffs for failing to yield to an emergency vehicle.

When we were first married and for approximately two years after that, we both worked at Goodwill Industries in Kalamazoo. Jerry earned \$1.25 an hour and I earned 85 cents an hour.

Since then we have moved to Plymouth, bought a condominium, and are gainfully employed. For several years after we moved here, Jerry worked for a local landscaping company where he worked himself up to foreman. For the

past eight years he has been the custodian at the First Baptist Church on N. Territorial Road. I have a master's degree in special education and teach for the Northville Public Schools in their institutional special education program.

We have learned through the years that true love is not all hearts and roses, moon, spoon and June. True love is having respect and patience with each other. It is building a relationship day in and day out. It is putting up with each other's weaknesses and faults — keeping in mind that nobody is perfect and that includes me too.

True love sometimes involves sacrifice. Trustees clarify proposals on March 27 bond issue

Plymouth-Canton school trustees want to make sure voters realize what the real choice is in the March 27 special election.

Tom Yack, board president, said Monday night that the real decision to be made is whether to realign grades or keep the present grade structure intact.

The discussion on the meaning of the three ballot proposals took place while the board voted formally to set Thursday, March 27, at the election date.

THE BALLOT proposals will be:

Proposition I: Bond issue of \$14,623,000 for reno-

vation of existing buildings, energy conservation measures, air-conditioning for Extended School Year expansion, purchase of buses, replacement of worn-out equipment, purchase of portable buildings, major renovation of Central Middle to bring it up to code, and a stage for East Middle School.

Proposition II: A bond issue of \$7,277,000 to build and equip a 40-classroom facility at the Centennial Educational Park for 1,000 high school students at a cost of \$5,277,000 and remodeling Central for high school use by about 1,200 students at a cost of \$2 million.

Proposition III: A half-mill levy of 10 years earmarked for maintenance to keep up school buildings once they have been returned to good condition.

If all three propositions pass, the cost to the owner of a \$60,000 home for 1980-81 would be: Proposition I, \$58.20; Proposition II, \$30.90; Proposition III, \$15; total, \$104.10. The added millage costs for the bonds in Propositions I, II will decrease each year after 1980-81.

YACK STRESSED that if Proposition I passes and II fails then the grades will be realigned to K-6, 7-9 and 10-12.

If Propositions I and II pass, then the grade structure will remain at K-5, 6-8, and 9-12. Yack added.

If only Proposition II passed, Yack said, the board would have to decide whether to borrow the \$7.3 million or reject it as an insufficient solution for the district's needs.

"If both bond propositions fail we still must come back to the voters for more money," said Steve Harper, board treasurer, "be it in June, August, September or October. We'll need more money, either from bonds or operational millage."

"Whether we go with bonds or operational millage, the cost the first year will be pretty much the same. The difference is that bonded millage goes down each year as the State Equalized Valuation (SEV) goes up. With operating millage you have to ask for more as inflation rises."

Yack noted there was unanimous agreement among trustees on the need for Propositions I, II — that the disagreement among trustees was on Proposition II only.

"If Proposition II fails we will realign the grades," said Dick Arlen, board vice president. "But even that will just be a short-term solution."

Elaine Kirchgatter, board secretary, said that grade realignment also would require more in operational millage if programs are to be maintained. Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, points out that if both bond proposals pass the debt levy would rise from the current 3.72 to 6.55 in 1980-81 and after six years would drop to 3.39 mills.

If only Proposition I is approved, Hoedel adds, it would take three years for the debt levy to drop below the current amount.

Schools tell labor costs for advice

Legal expenses related to labor negotiations for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools exceed \$55,000 for calendar year 1979.

According to figures compiled by the school district finance office, some \$57,647 has been spent to date in fees to labor lawyers.

The major legal advisor to the district for 1979 was the labor law firm of Clark, Hardy, Lewis and Fine.

Throughout the negotiations with the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA), the union representing teachers, two lawyers were chief spokesmen for the school board.

Some \$27,766 was paid to Clark, Hardy, Lewis and Fine for services at the negotiating table from May to November 1979.

The same legal firm also represented the school board in contract talks with the Plymouth Congress of Negotiators and charged fees of \$2,826 for negotiations from June to November 1979.

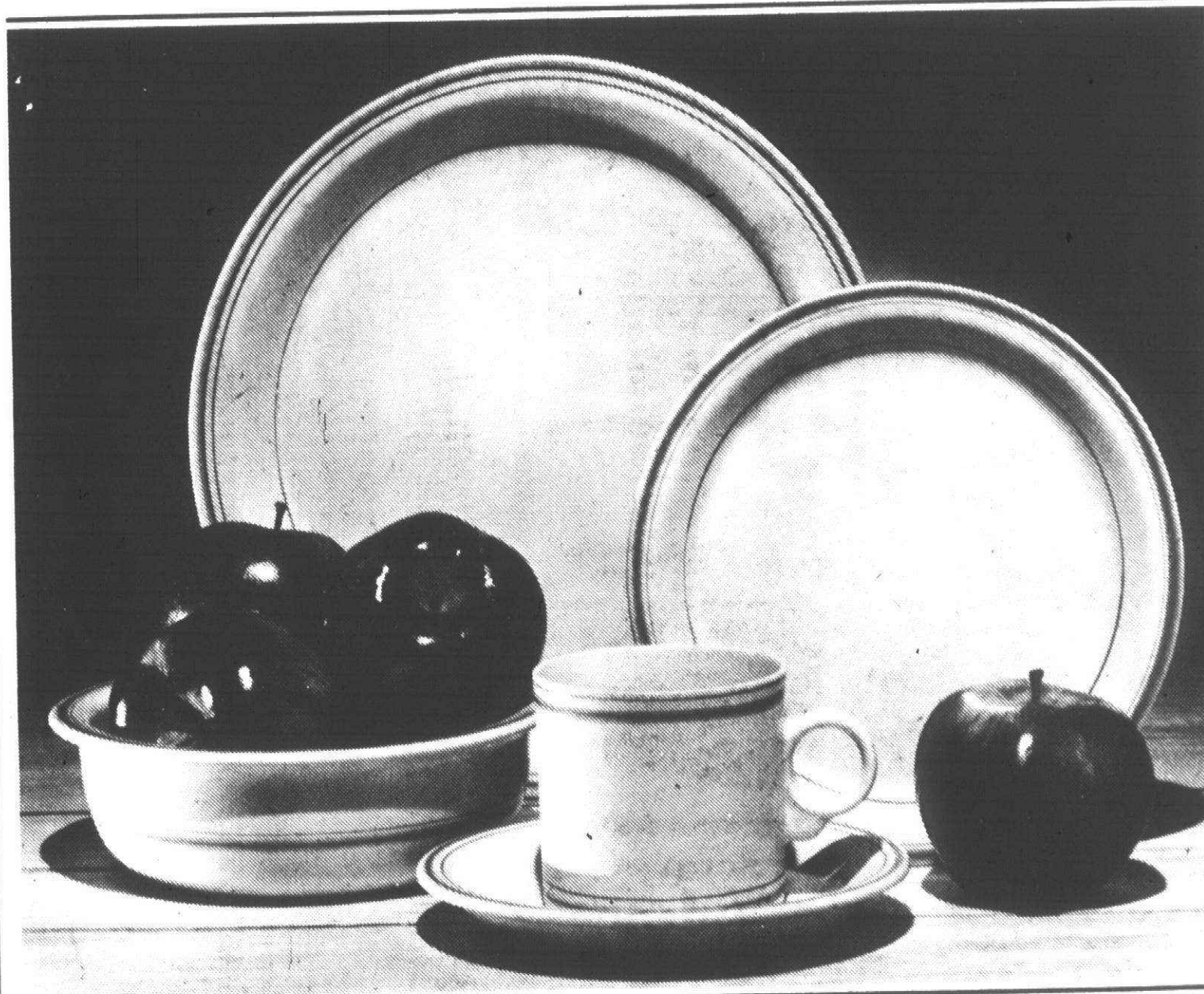
The same lawyers also handled legal consultations on new contract terms and conditions, provided legal representation for the board at hearings, and handled court appearances.

The firm also dealt with the bargaining unit representation election by the cafeteria staff and with arbitration questions. Fees for these services totaled \$18,890.

Some legal services for general school labor matters, such as injunctions and lawsuits, also were handled by the firm in 1979 for charges of \$8,165.

The district presently has settlements with its administrators who are unionized, with cafeteria workers, educational aides, and with maintenance workers. Working without ratified contracts are teachers, transportation employees, and secretaries.

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Plymouth Canton Community School may not realize how much of an "idea department" it has at its building and grounds maintenance division.

That's because whenever repairs are needed to vandalized school property, Les Tinson, department head, tries to do more than make the repairs and

wait for another call.

By the end of this fiscal year, Tinson estimates school property destruction will cost the district about \$50,000. He

says it's not a high figure as compared to other surrounding districts of near equal student population. However, it's enough to set one's mind rolling on "preventive maintenance."

Whenever Tinson has a idea that could remedy a district trouble spot, he writes it down. As for his assistant Dan Minghine, he's got a bedside tape recorder for the very same thing.

Here's some plans they have in the works to curb vandalism in the district's near future:

An experiment that's been tried at West Middle School may be working its way into the most heavily used restrooms at other district secondary schools. At West Middle, the depart-

ment installed electric hand driers to curb the use of paper products in such sprees as plugging plumbing fixtures and fire burnings.

MINGHINE ADDS they also will be eliminating all toilet paper rolls and replacing them with single fold toilet paper in response to the use of rolls in vandalism.

Another step in curbing vandalism in school washrooms will be permanently mounting partitions between stalls, they say. Presently, suspended partitions are easy targets for those interested in pulling them down.

cost the district \$27,000 since the start of its fiscal year last July. That's about \$3,000 more than was spent in replacement all last year.

To combat this problem, Tinson and Minghine will be looking into replacing all floor level windows with vandal-proof porcelain enamel panels which are resistant to breakage.

In response to frequent lawn destruction, caused by cars pulling off school driveways, the pair will be seeking bids for fences along these roadways. Presently, they are looking into small chain link fences along with some parking blocks to deter these short cuts on soft ground.

the building was designed to handle. There just aren't adequate areas for students to be in when they don't have classes to attend."

BUIKEMA SAID he toured Canton High on Monday and found all rest-rooms were open except except one in the gym area.

"I think the case in the paper was overstated. But there are times when maintenance has overreacted. A restroom will be cleaned in the afternoon and locked for the night. Sometimes they stay locked in the morning — it's a lack of communication."

Buikema said he had just left Canton High that night from a gymnastics meet that was in progress. "There were only 50 people at the meet, yet when I left I found four cars parked on the lawn. We often have problems with cars parked on the grass and with students driving cars over the lawn."

In summary, Buikema said more vandalism is occurring at the CEP because of: 1. The increased number of students at the park during the day and, 2. More intense use of the building at night and on weekends.

"Yes there is more vandalism occurring. But I can't say, though, where there is more vandalism per student."

this year than a year ago.

Acts of vandalism sometimes follow a pattern, Buikema added. "Two weeks ago we had a bad time because report cards came out and some students expecting to scrape by with "Ds" ended up with "Fs" and weren't too happy."


The Canton principal said the administrative team at his school did some brainstorming last week on possible ways of curbing acts of vandalism.

SUPERINTENDENT John M. Hober noted that vandalism is not a problem peculiar to the CEP but is plaguing school districts throughout metropolitan Detroit and the state.



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First woman is hired as CEP administrator

The administrative support staff at Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP) has been expanded with the addition of a ninth area coordinator.

The additional area coordinator was authorized recently by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education and Monday night the school board approved the hiring of Patricia Patton for the position.

Area coordinators provide supervision over specific subject areas at the

two high schools, act as a liaison between teachers and administrators, provide instructional leadership, and serve a counseling function for students assigned to them.

Ms. Patton, who will have 550 students assigned to her, will be in charge of the skills for living instruction, the library/media programs, and working with female students and teachers.

She is the first female to be assigned

an administrative position at the position at the CEP. Both principals and the other eight area coordinators are all males.

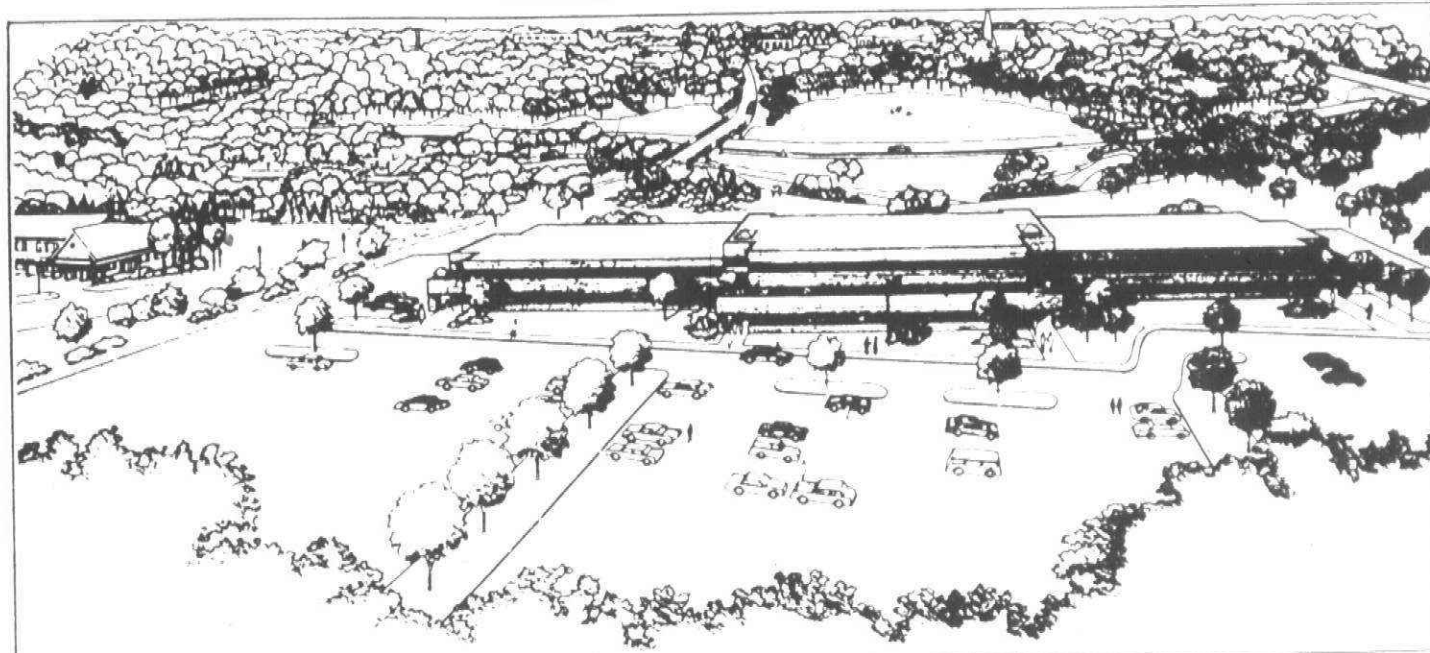
Some 75 persons applied for the job and 18 persons were interviewed. The screening committee then narrowed the field down to three and conducted another extensive interview before recommending Ms. Patton.

Ms. Patton, a learning specialist at Central Middle School, graduated in 1964 from Eastern Michigan University with a bachelor of science degree and earned a master's degree in reading in 1969 from Eastern. She now is working on a specialist's degree with a major in educational leadership.

She has more than four years experience teaching junior high classes for Livonia Public Schools, and has been in her present position for 2½ years. She also participated for one year in Plymouth-Canton's administrative intern program.

For some 10 years she has been involved as a bookkeeper, accountant and office manager for her husband's company, Clark-Patton, Inc.

The screening committee consisted of Bill Brown, Kent Buikema, Gary Faber, Jerry Ostoin, John Telford and Norm Kee.



Office complex proposed

Plans for a \$15 million office-apartment complex proposed near Hines Drive in Plymouth Township have been shelved and replaced by a proposed \$3.4 million office complex.

According to Erick Carne, the project's architect and one of three investors, "The plans have been changed for a number of reasons — most of them financial."

The Plymouth Township planning commission will be reviewing the new plans for the Plymouth Place Professional Plaza Feb. 20.

The proposed office complex is expected to cover 70,490 square feet on a

five-acre site on Plymouth Road directly across the street from the Hillside Inn. It will be built along a 400-foot bluff overlooking the Hines Parkway and the Old Village section of the city of Plymouth.

The building is planned as a three-story central core with two two-story wings. Preliminary designs also include solar heating for the water system, skylite atrium lobbies and roof-garden view porches.

Carne says construction is expected to begin this year with an opening date targeted for early 1981.

The other developers are Robert Stremich of Westland, who owns the

Hillside Inn, and William Robinson, a Plymouth industrialist and developer.

According to their estimates, the plaza is expected to employ between 400-500 office workers and another 15-25 service employees.

Developers also estimate the project could mean some \$22,000 annual taxes to the township and another \$175,000 in taxes to the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The tax breakdown also lists \$32,800 to Wayne County, \$9,300 to Schoolcraft Community College, and \$5,200 to the Wayne County Intermediate School District.

Achievement expert coming

These invitations are formal and informal, verbal and non-verbal, and may be found in every aspect of school life.

At the same time, teachers and others can communicate "disincentives" to students.

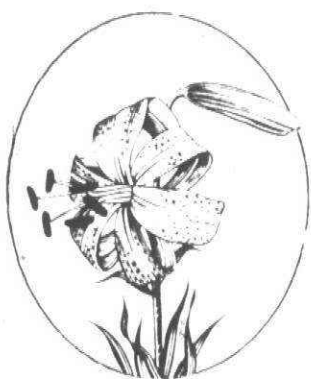

Industrial development is good use for funds

Canton Township has, at its disposal, about \$185,000 of uncommitted federal shared revenue. A new state law giving more money to communities is expected to allocate between \$275,000-\$325,000 to Canton by this summer.

This money has to be spent if Canton wants to continue to receive such hefty allotments. Some of the money (the total federal allotment was about \$430,000) has already been earmarked for specific projects. The rest is still available for any project the township dreams up that can qualify for state or federal approval.

One project getting serious consideration is the

possibility of sinking the money — or a large share of it — into some form of industrial development project.

It's a good idea. Using some of the revenue sharing funds to attract industry is the kind of investment that could bring long-range tax savings to Canton residents. The funds initially came from taxes. It makes sense to use the money in an effort to reduce taxes.

The reason industry in the township would reduce residents' taxes is simply that industry pays a higher tax payment.

INDUSTRIAL development, however, is not

without its drawbacks. Some industries pollute. Others are noisy and offensive.

Judicious zoning can take care of the latter problems. But communities are becoming increasingly aware that some industries have not shown enough responsibility when it comes to the well being of residents around them.

Thus, when it comes to industrial development, Canton walks a fine line.

On one hand, industry is something that should be actively pursued and prepared for (by paving Haggerty Road in the industrially-zoned area, for example). On the other hand, industries desiring to locate in Canton should be carefully scrutinized for

potential hazards.

Canton, with its reputation for being hard on business (which industrial corporation officials tend to assume will also apply to them), needs to change its reputation.

But it shouldn't change the hard line it has taken on ventures that would do more harm than good for the township.

It may be difficult for Canton to draw the proper line, but like it or not, industry is a necessary part of a healthy community.

An aggressive approach to recruiting industry with money to back the stand, is long overdue.

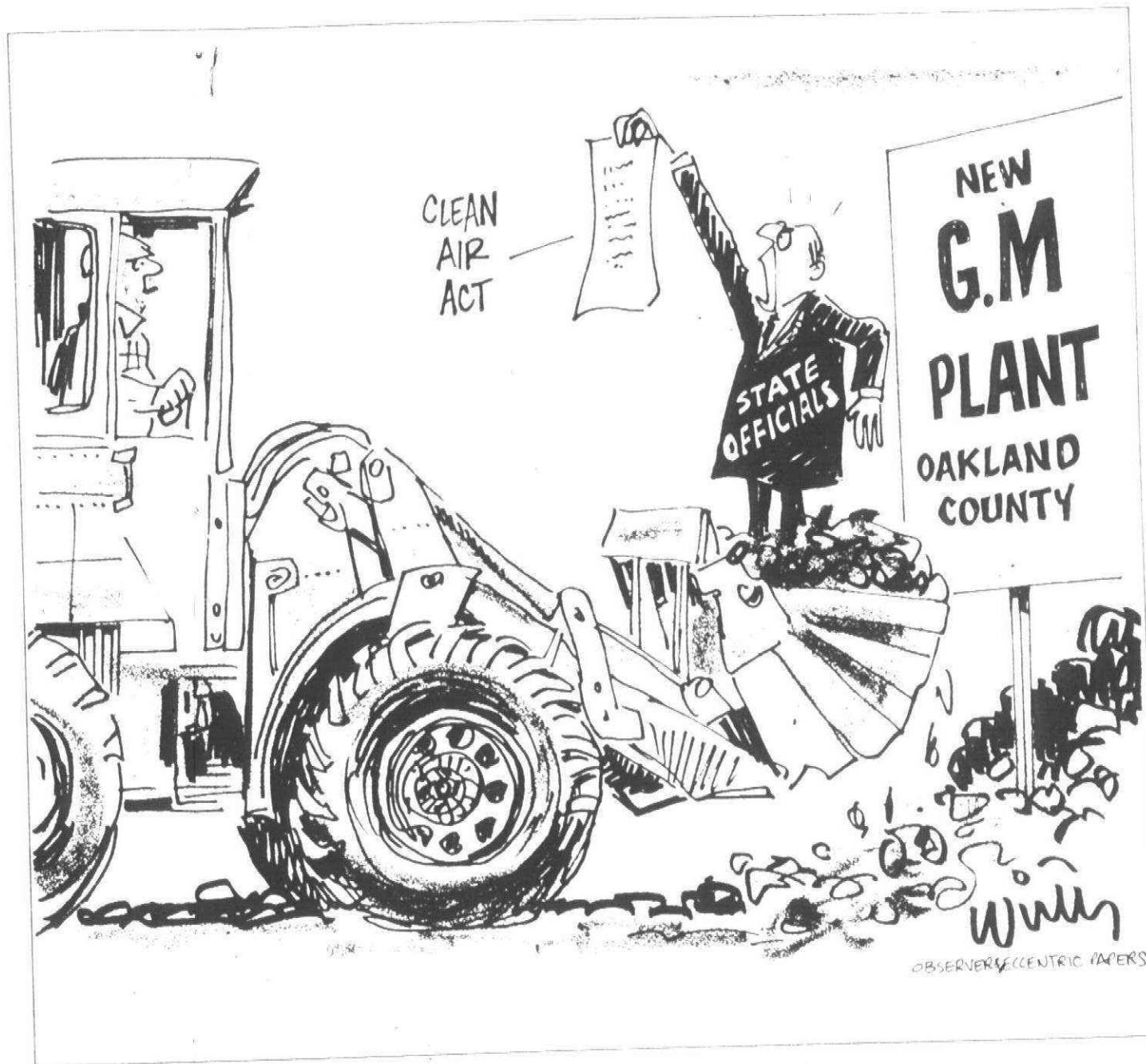
Realtorides thought, then responded, "Yes, if you shop diligently, you can find a low-priced stock after you have sold a high-priced stock."

Democrats to caucus

No more bushwhacking

Clear-thinking voters really needn't be upset over all this flap about the state Democratic Party delegate selection process.

In recent weeks we've read a lot about how a "meaningful" presidential primary is going the way of the whooping crane.

Some indignant legislators (who are responsible for the whole mess, anyway) are screaming that the people's rights are being taken away if the Democratic Party negates the results of the open primary and uses the caucus, instead.

Nonsense — pure poppycock.

Michigan Democrats, on order from the national party, asked the legislature for a closed primary. The Lansing lawmakers have refused to budge, hence the caucus system.

While a caucus does make it more difficult for the average Joe Blow to go cast a vote, it also insures that a voter will have to use a bit more intelligence than a zoo baboon before pulling down the lever.

In short, the caucus system will allow only Democrats to vote in a Democratic primary. So what?

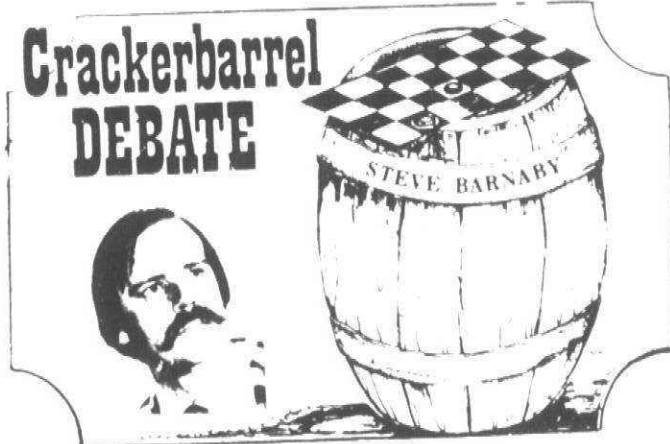
Those who envision a return to smoke-filled rooms of yesteryear are mistaken.

STRONG PARTY politics is an important part of American government. It gives voters a chance to affiliate themselves with a philosophy — a style of running government.

If voters are unsure of the candidates, they should at least have the confidence of a party vote.

And parties are made up of people — just like you and I. The caucus system will force voters to think about party affiliation. It will strengthen and purify our party system.

To participate in a caucus, all a Michigan voter has to do is join the Democratic Party by Feb. 26 — not such a grievous sin. The reality, of course, is



that fewer persons will participate because of political apathy. That is a grievous sin. But that's not the fault of the Democratic party.

Certainly, a closed primary would be preferable over a caucus system, but the wrangling in the legislature has killed that option.

TAKE A moment to examine "open" presidential primary results in Michigan.

Recall that George Wallace swept the Democratic primary in 1972. He garnered more than 809,000 votes against George McGovern's 425,000 and Hubert Humphrey's 249,000.

This was a classic case of Republicans ignoring their primary in which Richard Nixon faced underdog Paul McCloskey, and muddying the Democratic primary results.

In 1976 Republicans didn't have the luxury of playing in the other kids backyard.

While only 330,000 "Republicans" cast votes in the 1972 primary, more than a million cast ballots in 1976. Either a lot of Michigan voters decided to change parties between 1972 and 1976 or somebody was playing games and causing havoc in the other guy's camp.

We can be assured that none of that nonsense will be going on in the 1980 Michigan Democratic caucus process.

Is preservation fair to farmers?

Editor:

I support preserving farmland if one's income derives from farming. There are federal programs to help farmers. Needless to say, these programs could be improved.

Canton's proposed program does not help the farmer improve his production.

Before the farmland preservation issue was put on the 1978 ballot, Canton Township spent over \$30,000 to determine how much development rights would cost. The cost is \$16 million or four mills. They also had a group on the streets explaining the proposal and sending informational pamphlets in the mail. Farmland preservation was defeated by the people.

If the federal government pays 50 percent of the development rights (federal money is taxpayers' money), Canton residents still have to pay \$8 million or two mills plus the inflation rate until the program is started. But if the federal government doesn't pay 50 percent, then the farmland director talks of outside resources. No one will invest \$16 million or \$8 million for good will.

Even as a Canton businessman, I'm not in the need of a greater population, now now or in the future.

Farmland preservation for growth control is a bad way to go. We will, without question, shortchange the farmer. He will be used and abused and not helped. His needs are good roads, good field drainage, clean ditches and low taxes. Canton Township has neither. (Point of interest: A good portion of farmland is owned by developers and land speculators. The farmers lease that land for farming.)

The farmland director states, "Reduce your taxes substantially." I doubt that. My concerns are for the homeowner. I'm a homeowner in Canton Township and our taxes can be controlled by the vote of the people. To keep a lid on taxes is the reason for Headlee, which was voted in by the people.

My concerns are for the few farmers who own land in that area, because this has prevented and reduced their property potential. This seven-year proposal has caused hardship to some people. It's become a moral issue.

My home base of West Bloomfield, like other area townships, has "Annual Clean-Up Days."

As she approached, I saw something glitter from the middle of the bowknot in front of her neck. It was a large diamond stickpin.

My initial reaction was to wonder if my tax money would allow for such impressive looking undercover surveillance to seek out scavengers.

THEN THE LADY started to speak. She said she had an appointment with a real estate agent to look at the house behind the gate, and she asked me if I had seen anybody around. I told her that I had just driven up and hadn't noticed anyone.

This friendly individual told me that during a recent cruise, she and her husband decided that they must live on a lake. Their present home was much larger and on much more land than this one, but now that the children were away at boarding schools, it seemed an appropriate time to cut down on living space and house hold help.

We talked about the area and I was able to provide some information. I remembered when the asking price for the house on the corner, the one with the tennis courts, had been less than \$100,000. (At that time I had called the agent out of curiosity.) But since then I noted the prices of prestigious lakefront property had nearly tripled.

What's an alley? A place to raise roses

During the course of a recent conversation with several members of the younger generation, The Stroller happened to mention that he was born and raised in an alley back in the Pennsylvania Dutch country.

"An alley?" one of the young lads repeated with a puzzled look on his face. "What's an alley? I never heard of one."

The remark stunned The Stroller for a moment. Then it dawned on him that alleys passed out of existence long ago and now can be listed in the limbo of forgotten things.

If the young lad had looked in Webster's dictionary, he would have learned that an alley is a passageway in the middle of a city block that gives access to the rear of buildings.

But that possibly wouldn't have satisfied him and he would have wondered no doubt how it happened that The Stroller was born and raised in that sort of a setting.

THE HOME in which The Stroller lived before he

followed Horace Greeley's advice to come west, was in between two main streets and was faced on one side by a high board fence and between two barns.

In those days, long before the automobile became popular, the folks on the main street usually built a barn at the end of their lots after deeding a portion of the ground to the utility companies for the erec-

tion of poles to carry telephone and electric wires. They never were on the main street.

With the coming of the automobile these barns were turned into garages. And where the owners didn't have automobiles, they erected houses for the lower income families. For instance, the rent on our little home of four rooms and a hallway was a mere \$5 a month at the turn of the century.

With the erection of the utility poles, the need came for more space to accommodate the company's trucks. These alleys became thoroughfares of not less than 12 or more than 16 feet in width. So, in our house, we looked at a high board fence that was only 16 feet away. Such conditions wouldn't be allowed today.

The coming of the automobile, plus the increase in population helped bring about the elimination of alleys. The owners of the "horseless carriage" soon found out that the alleys were too narrow in which to make the turn into the building and the change was made. In fact, that's how the present day ga-

rage in influential neighborhoods has become part of the residence.

ASIDE FROM THAT, with the population increase, the land became too valuable and in many cases the utility companies were forced to place the wires underground and eliminate the poles.

This brought about the passing of the alley and now these narrow passageways are in the limbo of forgotten things along with such things as private shaving mugs in the barbershops and spitons — the forerunners of cuspidors that also are now only memories.

Mere mention of an alley today calls to mind one of The Stroller's favorite stories of his mother.

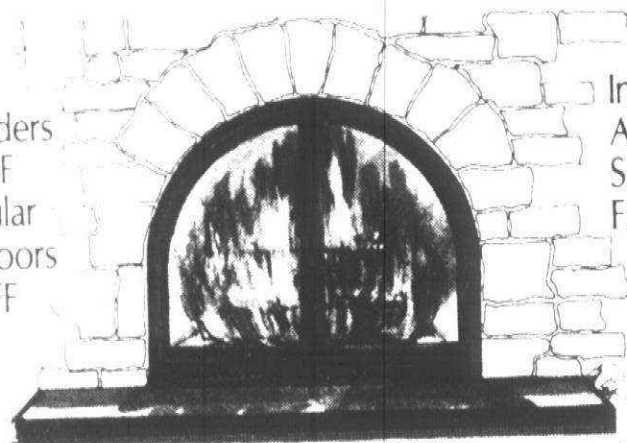
One evening while we were with her on a shopping trip, mother overheard a lady mention something derogatory about the kids in the alley.

"I'll have you know that you can raise just as nice roses in the alley as you can in the street."

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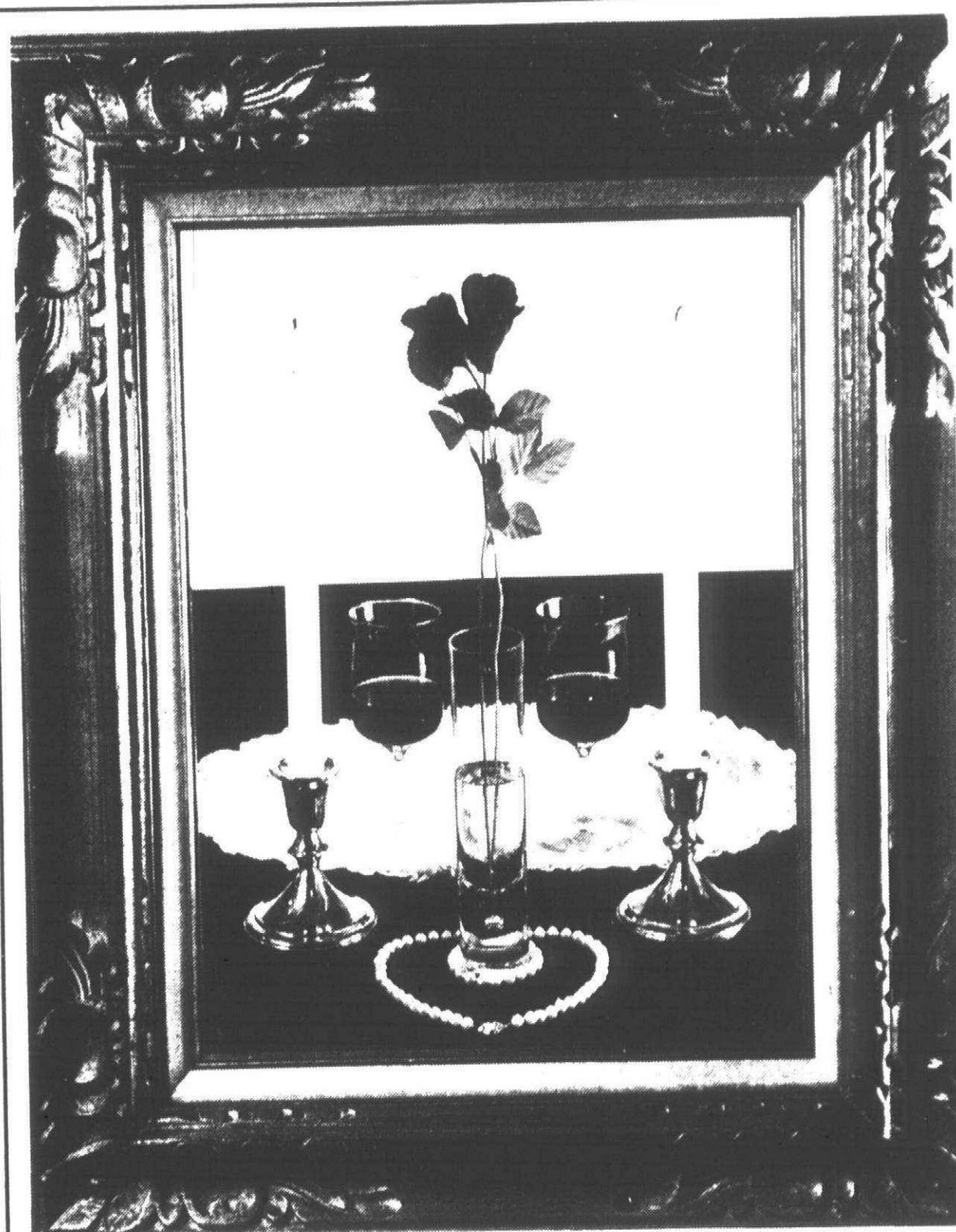
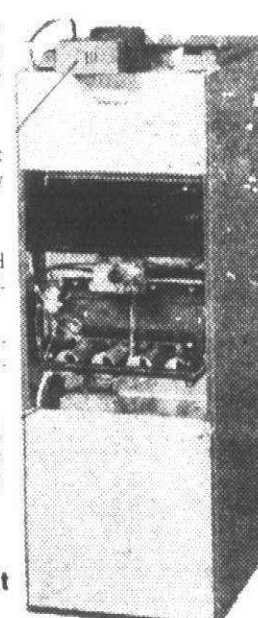
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Secretaries deserve a fair contract

Editor:

As the husband of a secretary employed by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools for the past 2½ years, I feel the time has come for the general public to be made aware of the status of current negotiations between the school system and the secretarial association.

It is rapidly becoming apparent that the school district is not bargaining in good faith and has no intention of doing so in the near future. As husband of a secretary and as a taxpayer in the district I find it appalling that the administration and elected school board members show so little concern for their employees' welfare.

The average hourly rate of the secretarial staff is \$5.20 and they have not been given a raise since July 1, 1978. In the Detroit area from July 1 to Dec. 31, 1978, the cost of living rose by 3.6 percent. From Jan. 1, 1979 through Dec. 31, 1979, the cost of living increased another 15 percent. Thus since July 1978 (the date of the last increment raise of the secretarial staff) the cost of consumer goods have risen by 18.67 percent.

The secretarial bargaining team has been trying to negotiate a contract

since April 1979. Since then the secretaries have been working on a contract extension that only they seem to be required to honor. They were due an increment raise on July 1, 1979, which they did not receive.

Administration says they will receive it retroactively when the contract is settled. But they won't receive any interest on that money. I think it is safe to assume, though, the school district is investing these monies and collecting interest on it.

Meanwhile the secretaries are losing interest on the money which they could be banking in their own savings accounts.

If the money is to be paid retroactively than it should be placed in an escrow account where it can draw interest. Than the retroactive adjustment along with interest can be divided amongst the secretaries when the new contract is settled.

Administrators and executive secretaries, who earn much higher salaries to begin with, were granted salary increases some time ago by the school board. If the board feels an assistant superintendent cannot live on less than \$43,000 a year, how can they expect a secretary to manage on \$10,000 a year

or less? In the future administrators should not receive salary increases until all contracts have been settled.

I would like to suggest that the general public get in touch with school board members (who they elected to

represent them) and urge them to get actively involved with the administration and see that all outstanding contracts in the district are settled.

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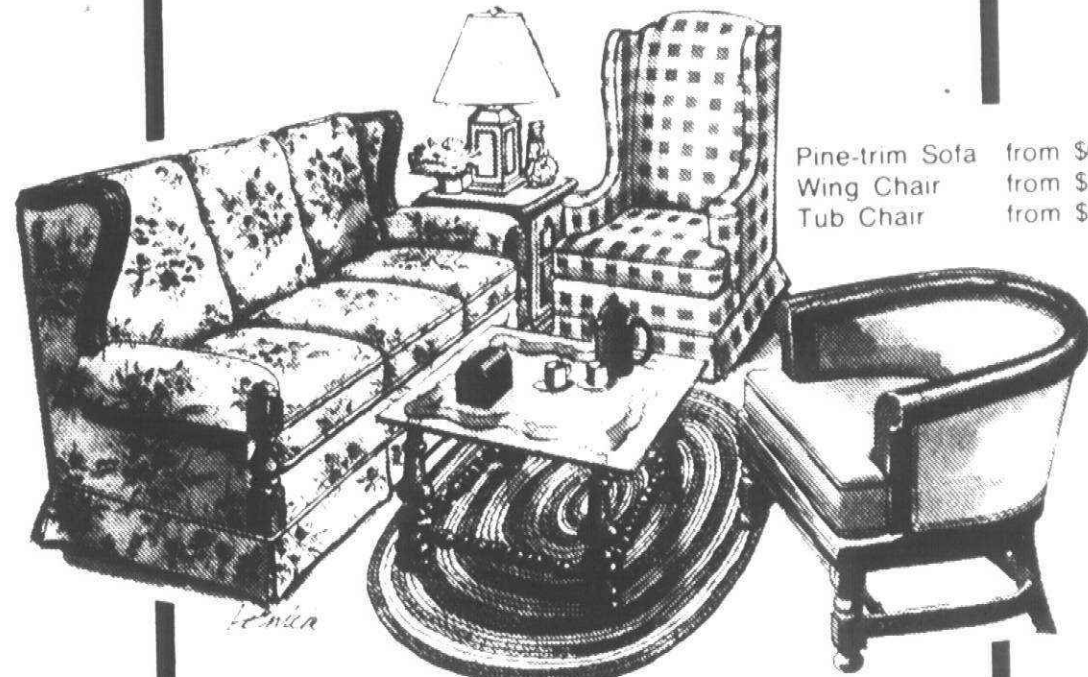
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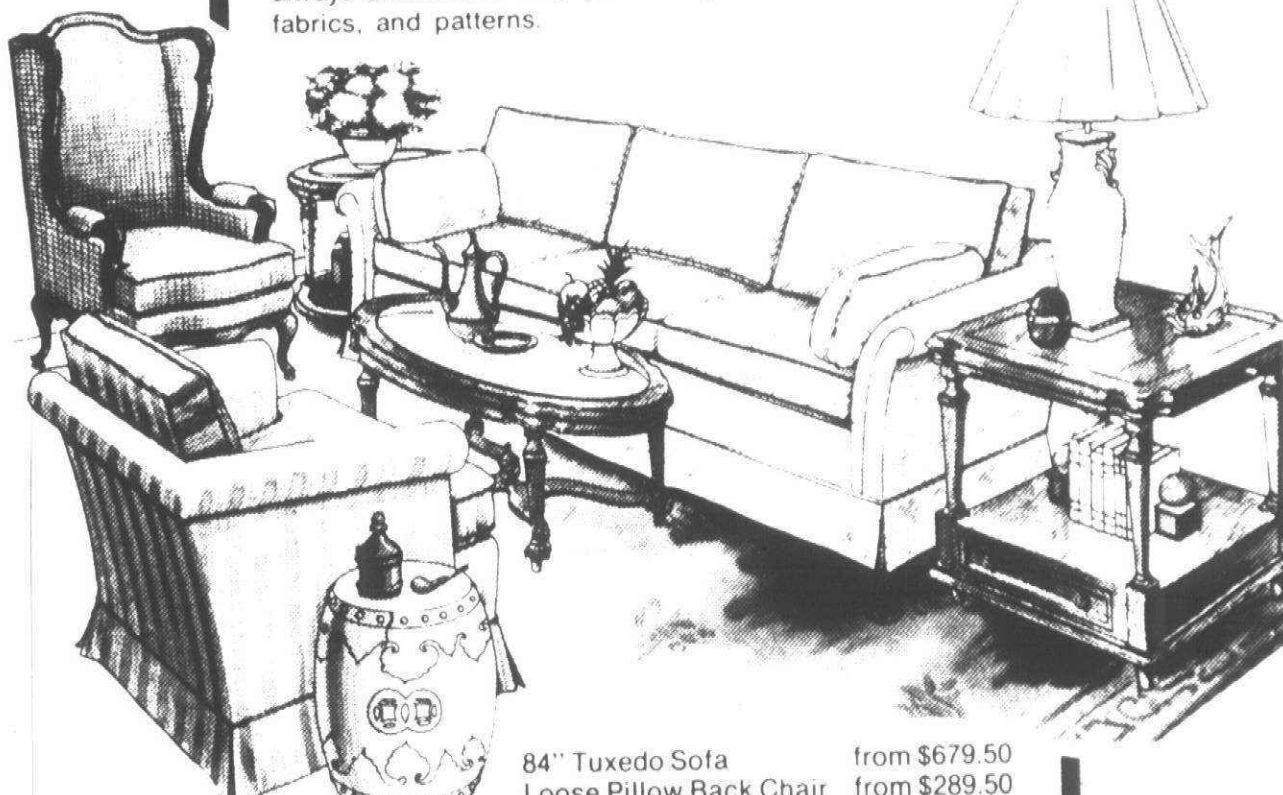
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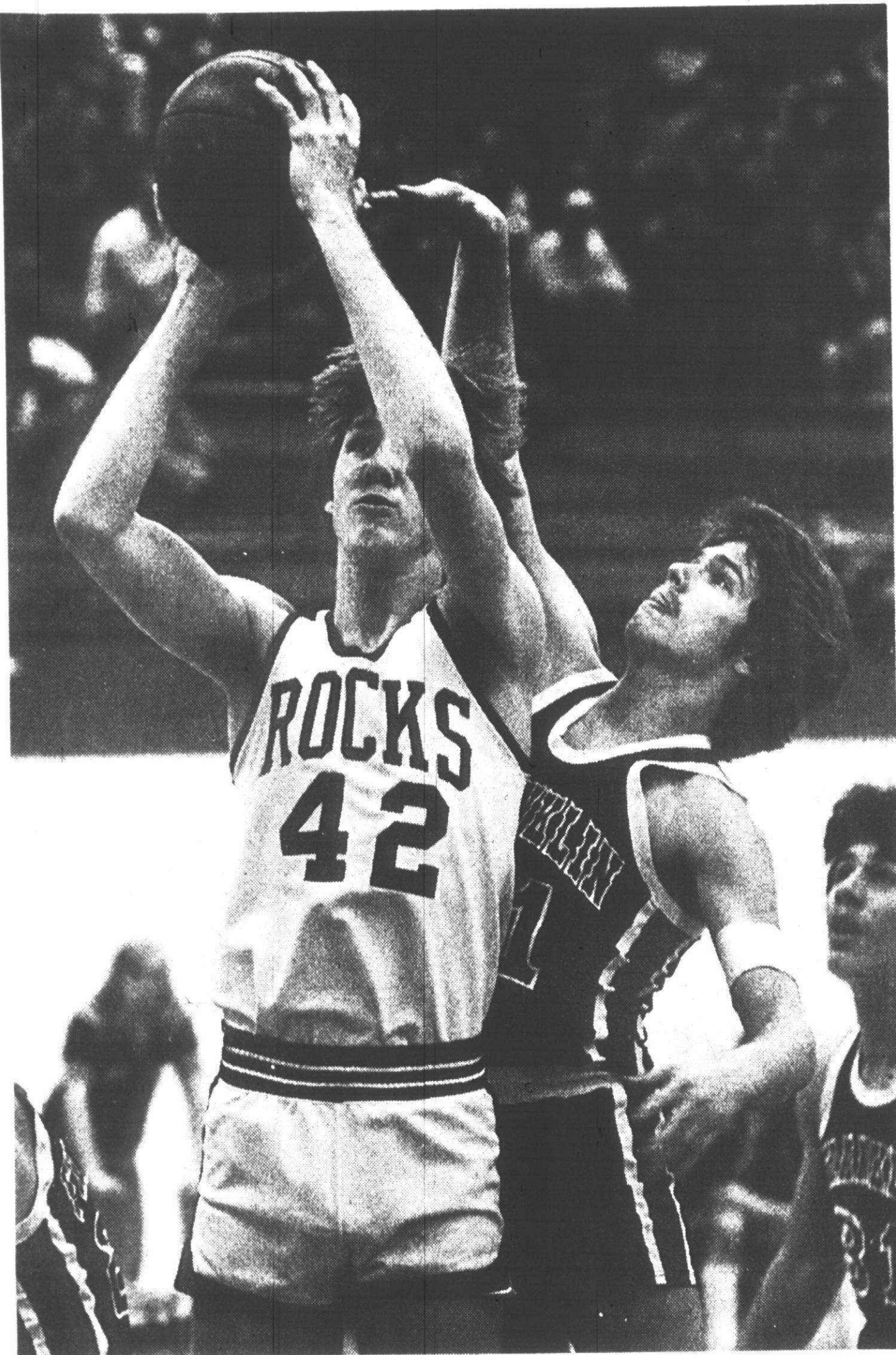

Plymouth Salem cagers nip Franklin in overtime

Forced into overtime by a determined Livonia Franklin basketball team, Plymouth Salem escaped with a 73-69 victory Tuesday night at home.

Salem is now 13-2 overall while Franklin slipped to 9-6.

It was a hard-fought battle all the way in a duel between two league leaders before a sparse crowd and University of Michigan coach Johnny Orr in attendance.

Franklin, leading the Northwest Suburban League with a 6-1 mark, trailed by as many as eight points in the latter stages of the fourth quarter.

Salem center Howard Monk, who led all scorers with 28 points, hit a layup with 1:49 left to give the Rocks a 64-56 advantage.

But a furious full-court press by the Patriots quickly turned that lead into a nip-and-tuck affair. Guard Doug White's three-point play eight seconds after Monk's basket cut the Rocks' advantage to five.

Franklin point-guard Jon McCarthy, who paced the Patriots with 23 points, then connected on two free throws with 1:24 to go, slicing the margin to three, 64-61.

Monk followed by committing a turnover in front of the Patriots' bench, but Franklin could not convert, fouling Salem's Rob Neu in the backcourt with exactly 1:00 remaining.

HE HIT one of two free throws to up the Salem lead to four, but McCarthy quickly responded with a long jumper from the dead corner.

Neu was fouled again with 48 seconds left and he missed the front end of a one-and-one free throw situation. Franklin grabbed the rebound and scored when White grabbed a loose ball underneath, tying the game at 65 with 22 seconds remaining.

Salem marched the ball down the floor and had three attempts in the waning seconds, but failed to convert.

In overtime, Neu scored four straight points in the first minute to give the Rocks a 69-65 cushion. Meanwhile, Franklin missed two shots before McCarthy hit a jumper with 30 seconds to go. Monk iced the game for Salem with two free throws in the final nine seconds.

"They don't back off a lick," said Salem Coach Fred Thomann. "They are a good basketball team. I'm not surprised with their shooting. We had a hard time identifying that they could

shoot beyond 20 feet."

It appeared the Rocks had the command during some stages of the third quarter only to have Franklin fight back with its stellar shooting and aggressive defense.

SALEM GOT a lift in the shooting department from sophomore Mike McBride, who tallied eight points and drew praise from Thomann.

"He gave us a tremendous effort," said the Salem coach. "He (Mike) played well defensively and shot the ball real well."

The Salem coach was also happy with the play of his backcourt — Neu and junior Mike Sharp.

"This is the best game they played this year as a tandem," Thomann said. Neu had 17 points and seven rebounds while Sharp added nine assists. Franklin Coach Jim McIntyre was

equally satisfied with his team's play. The Patriots had to go without its top inside player, 6-2 center Jeff Weber, who sat out the game with an ankle injury.

"I'm definitely pleased," said McIntyre. "I can't say enough about their willingness to hang in. They all came to play. I have no qualms."

Rock wrestlers wrap up league

4 champs crowned

A second-place finish in the league meet Saturday at Trenton was good enough to give Plymouth Salem's wrestlers the overall Suburban Eight League team championship.

Salem, coached by Ron Krueger, finished second behind Belleville in the league meet. But the Rocks claimed the league title by going unbeaten in duals while Belleville incurred losses to Salem and Trenton.

Belleville would have needed a second-place finish in the regular season dual standings to claim a share of the title.

The Tigers totaled 183½ points Saturday, edging Salem which accumulated 180½. Trenton, second during the regular season, placed third with 138½.

The Rocks had four individual champions — Jim Schultz (108), Jeff Brown (122), Steve Szilagyi (170) and Jeff Powers (188).

"It was a combination of things which beat us," said Salem Coach Ron Krueger. "We were worried about Trenton and Belleville came in here really flying. They snuck by everybody."

Schultz, a senior, raised his victory total to 41 this season with an 8-1 decision over Trenton's Ken Barnes in the finals at 108 pounds.

Brown, the career win record holder

at Salem, won his championship final by decisioning Alan Burgmooser of Trenton, 5-1.

SZILAGYI, just a junior, took the 170-pound final by whipping Edsel Ford's Ed Elder, 11-2.

Powers won a tight 4-2 overtime decision over Belleville's Terry Calhoun at 188 pounds. The Rock senior now has over 30 victories this season.

At 115 pounds Salem's Jeff Dunson reached the finals before losing to Trenton's Jeff Owens, 7-3.

At 129 pounds Kelly Carmichael of Edsel Ford and Salem's Mark Ross renewed their rivalry. Carmichael came through with a 5-3 decision to take the crown.

Belleville's Lonnie Renfro pulled off a major upset at 141 pounds when he came from behind to beat Salem's Jerry Valchine in overtime, 8-1. Renfro trailed in regulation time until the final five seconds when he tied the match. Valchine has 43 victories this season.

A couple of football standouts went at it in the 201-pound weight class. Edsel Ford's Pat Brackett pinned Sa-

lem's Stan Snider in the finals in 1:13.

Salem's Scott Piper, a senior, took third place in the 158-pound class with a 9-8 decision over Bentley's Rick Smith. Teammate Rob Price did likewise in the 148-pound division when he defeated Ken McIntosh of Trenton, 3-1.

Freshman record holder Jeff Wojcik of Salem also took third. He beat Edsel Ford's Wally Clem in the consolation final, 9-0.

SALEM PLACED third or better in 12 of the 13 weight classes.

The Rocks certainly missed 135-pounder Bruce Bachman who was home because of illness.

"We had a really rough week," said Krueger. "I think we'll be all right for the districts on Saturday."

Salem will compete in the Class A district tourney at Ann Arbor Huron. The Rocks are now ranked No. 6 in Class A by the Michigan High School Wrestling Coaches Association (MHSWCA). Belleville, rated No. 5, will also compete at Huron.

The top four finishers in each weight

division Saturday at Huron will advance to the regionals Feb. 16 at Westland John Glenn.

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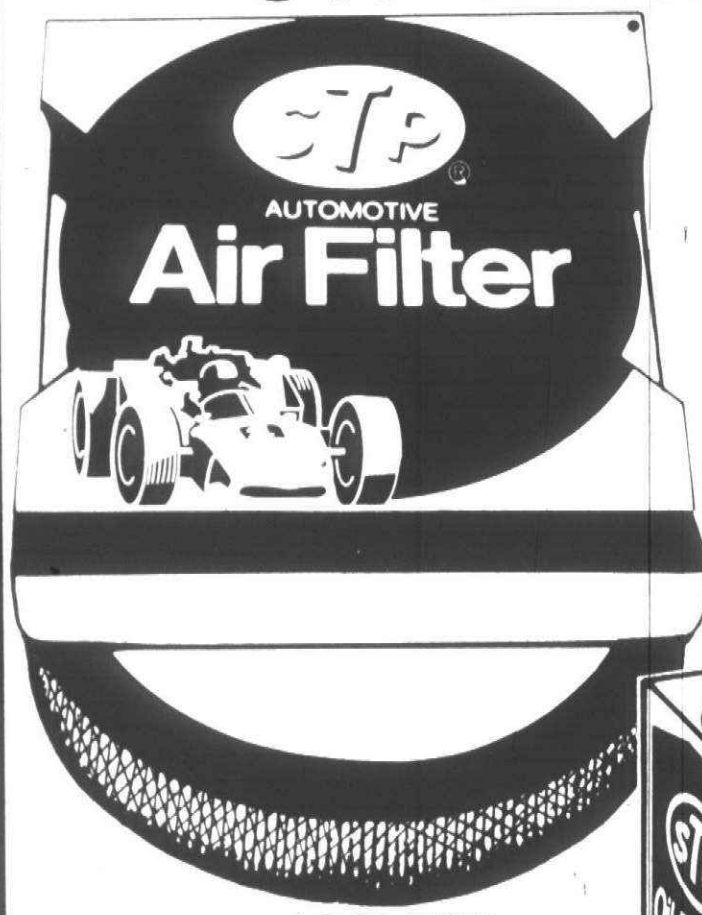
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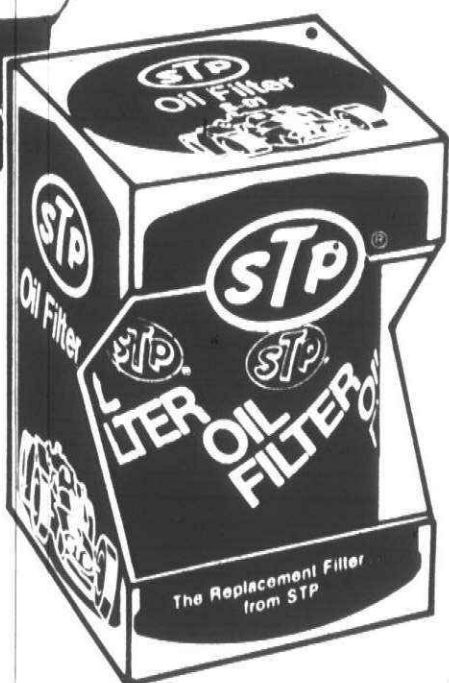


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Charger spikers blast Canton

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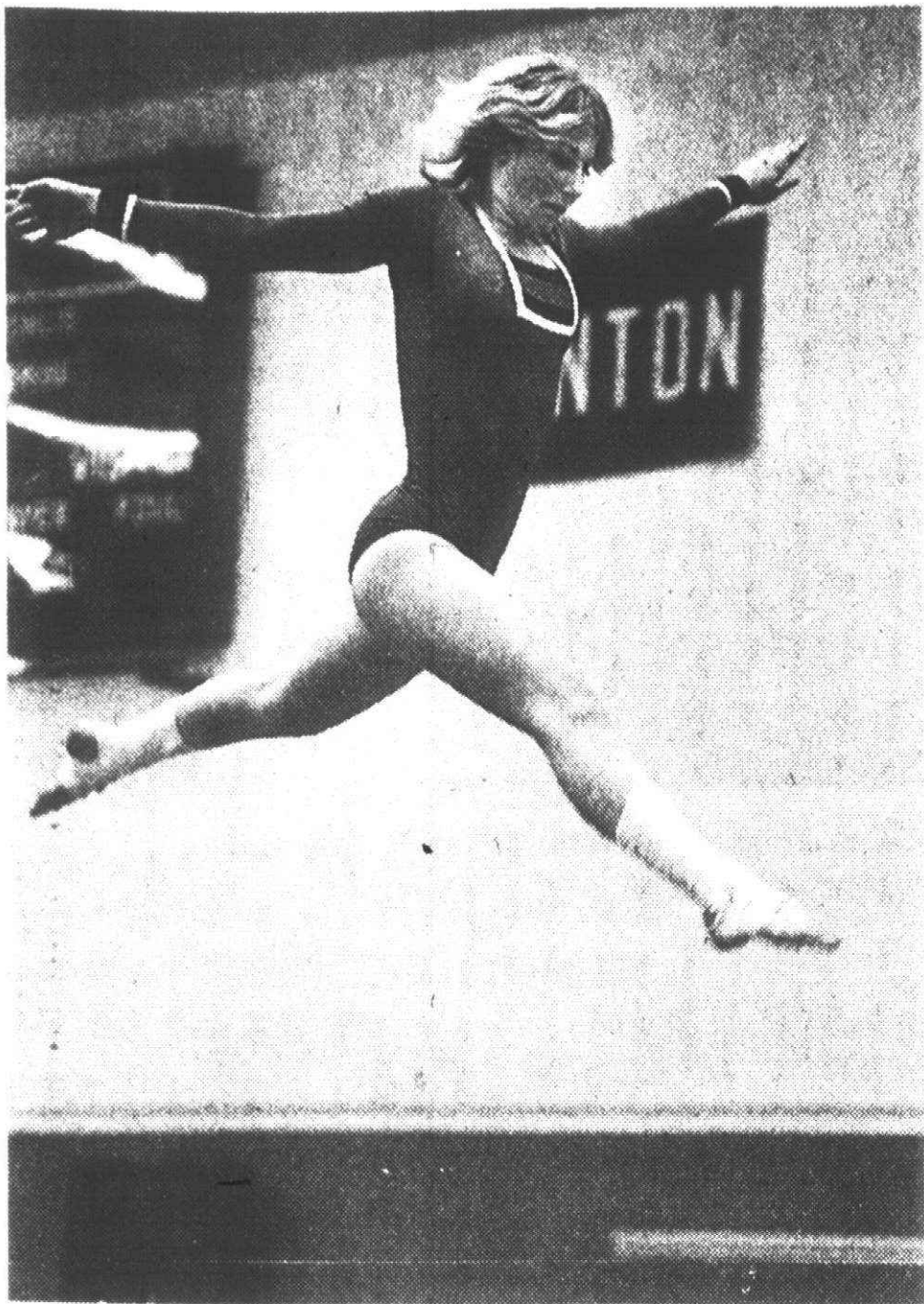

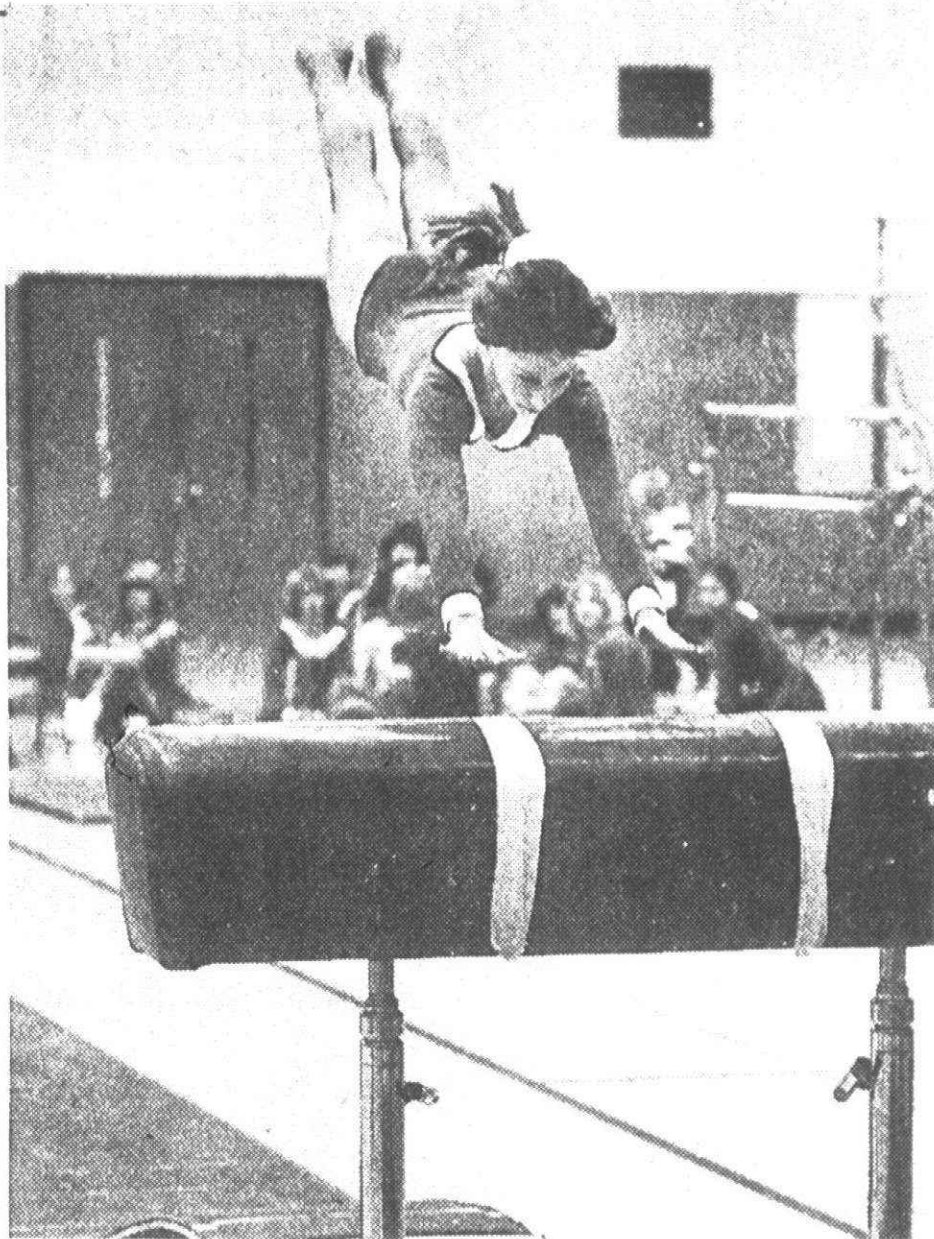
"They had no super girl," said Cunningham, "but they had a lot of good ones. This was not our best meet, but we did well to beat them."

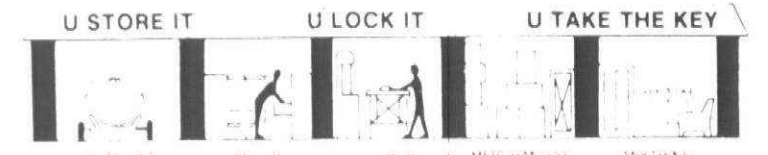

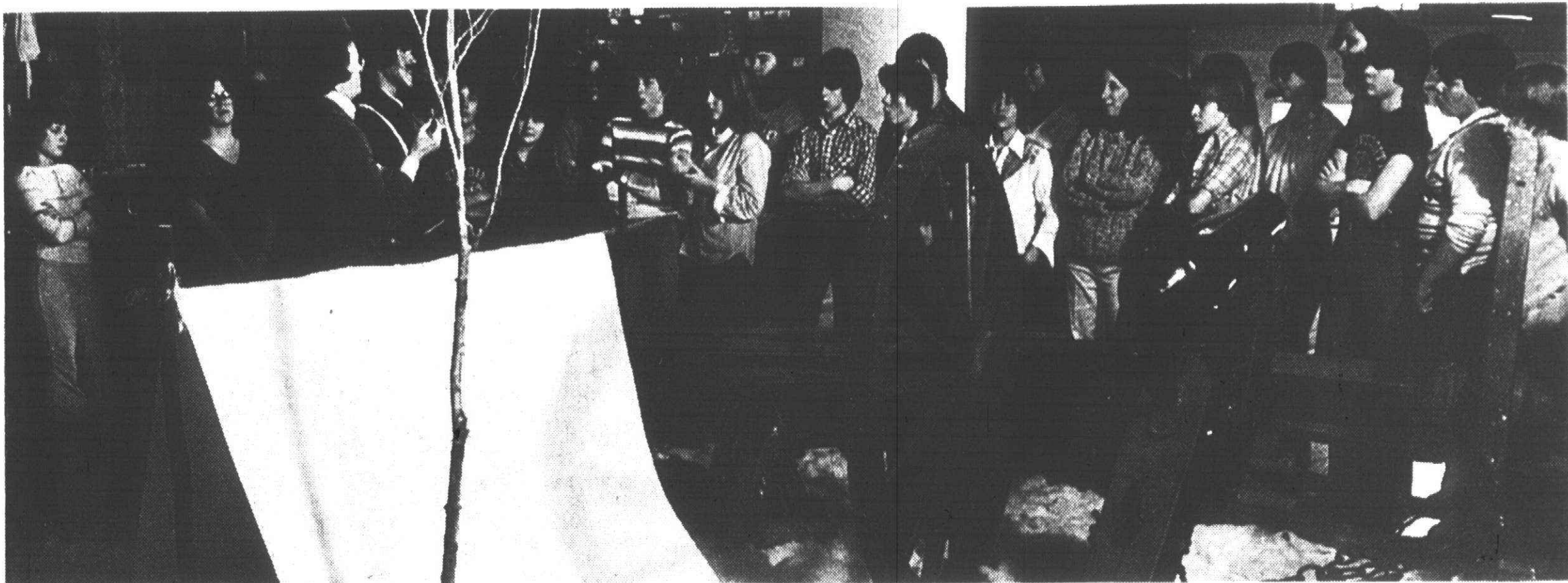

24th Infantry which was part of the Iron Brigade. In just an hour and a half, 100 men enlisted; 77 of these were from Plymouth and they became members of Company C.

Before the war ended, 400 men from the area were in the Union Army and 100 of these were under 21.

Mrs. Mitchell told an eighth-grade class from Central Middle School that there were more than 300 boys in the Union Army who were 13 and under. Twenty-five were just 10 years old.

THESE WERE THE drummer boys. They marched as many as 16 miles a day with the troops, hauled powder for the field artillery, moved the dead and wounded, and drummed the soldiers into action.

They also were sent out to forage for supplies. Mrs. Mitchell explained that the foraging often meant stealing chickens and vegetables from farmers.

The class examined the tent, which was in two parts so each soldier could carry a half. Inside the tent, there is bedding, a quilt and a blanket. Mrs. Mitchell said the war came without warning and the Army had no supply of blankets. The average family lacked blankets as well, as everyone used homemade quilts. So they took along quilts from home to keep them warm.

The guns and the bayonet attracted special attention. The class learned that just 1 percent of the deaths in the Civil War were caused by bayonet wounds. Their most practical use was that of candle holder. The gun, a Springfield 64, fired two rounds a minute.

"THIS HARDTACK really tells the story of the war," said Mrs. Mitchell.

"It was called the 'iron cracker' and soldiers were warned not to drop it on their foot. The soldiers would soften it in their coffee before eating. The weavils would float to the top so they could skim them off. The men liked to eat in the dark because their food was so rotten."

As they looked at a shoe with wooden pegs, they learned that it was not until after the war that shoes were made for the left and right feet. Before that, they were made on a common last (a from shaped like a human foot).

"They thought both feet should look alike," said Mrs. Mitchell. "There was no right or left, so they just wore them on either foot. The soldiers' feet bothered them so much, they decided to make a left shoe and a right shoe."

"But the men were not familiar with the right and left. To help remember which went where, they tied a piece of hay to one shoe and piece of straw to other."

"Instead of saying 'left, right' when they marched, they said, 'Hay-foot, straw-foot.'"

As they visited the museum blacksmith shop, they heard about the importance of the blacksmith during the war.

"They were the most-protected persons in the army," Mrs. Mitchell told them. One blacksmith would shoe 500 horses or mules in a day.

"They used wagons for everything — to carry supplies and as ambulances. The Union Army bought 14,500 wagons and captured 2,000 from the South in a single year."

"ONE OF the most unnecessary items provided to the northerners was the havelock."

She told the students that because the Union Army would be heading south, there was concern that many of the men would suffer from heatstroke. The havelock was to shade the men's heads and shoulders from the sun.

"They made thousands of these but they turned out to be a nuisance to the soldiers," she said.

Mrs. Mitchell did include some statistics: One million persons died, the most in any war in which the United States has been involved; twice as many deaths were caused by disease as by gunfire.

One of the requirements of enlistment was four front teeth, said Mrs. Mitchell. A soldier needed those teeth to tear the paper cartridges open so that powder would go into the barrel and ignite.

There were some who broke off their teeth to stay out of the Army.

AND WHAT were the women doing during the war?

They started out making "silly things" for the soldiers. They made batches of scarves so all the soldiers would have scarves that matched. They made fancy little cockades for their hats. That was in the early days when the war was new," said Mrs. Mitchell.

Soon the word came: "Stop sending silly things and start making lint for bandages." So the women scraped linen thread to make the lint. They also made thousands of "housewives" which were sewing kits containing needle, thread, buttons, safety pins, etc.

A housewife is included in the museum collection.

As the men left the farms, the women became solely responsible for everything.

"They already were working 12-14 hours a day and now they had this added load. They had no business experience and many farms were lost. A few women enlisted, pretending they were men. The officers' wives joined their husbands at winter camp."

The Civil War display will be in the museum until mid-April. Arrangements for the educational tours can be made by calling the museum, 455-8940.

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
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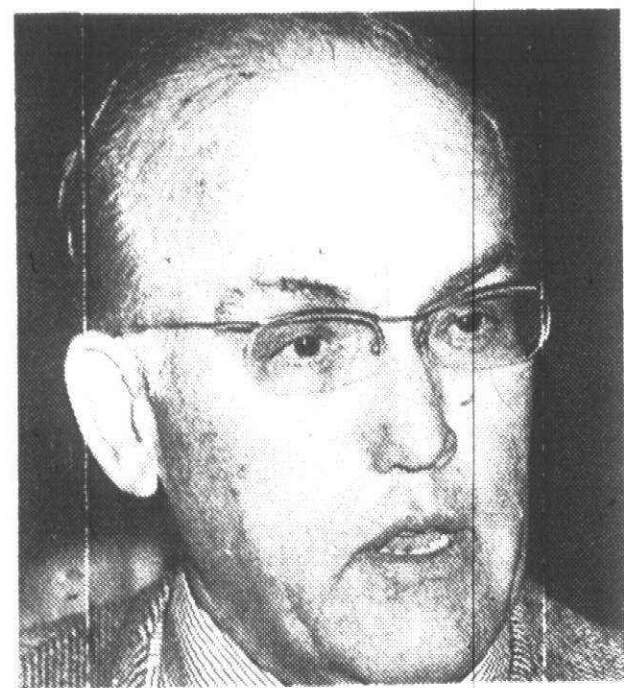

Would you or wouldn't you?

Dr. Richard Straith's talk on plastic surgery produced two kinds of responses to this question from his Livonia Town Hall audience.

"I might try it," declared Hazel Simon, 71, of Plymouth. "When you get to the point where you're not going to live very long, you may as well look nice."

Barbara Core of Livonia differed.

"Have plastic surgery? Spend all that money? Hell, no," she said. "I'm 54 and have four grandchildren. What would I do that for? I'm hoping my personality will detract from my wrinkles. This is the face God gave me."

"I've been married 35 years to the same guy who likes me the way I am. Once I went so far as to get my hair set. I thought I looked spiffy. But the whole family complained. They said, 'You don't look like you.'"

One of the few men in the audience, Kenneth Wilderen of Presbyterian Village in Redford Township, said he prefers to judge people on their personality and what they can do rather than their looks.

"I wouldn't be afraid," said Judy McIntyre of Livonia. "It's true you have to have other qualities than beauty. But if your nose or something else bothers you, there is nothing wrong with getting it looked after."

Model June Lark of Livonia agreed that people in this country are too preoccupied with beauty. "But in my business, it's your paycheck," she said.

WHATEVER THE OPINION, those in the town hall audience were more knowledgeable about plastic surgery, after hearing the speaker in the Mai Kai theater and at the celebrity luncheon in the Mayflower Meetinghouse.

Dr. Straith spends his days in Straith Memorial Hospital in Southfield.

He reshapes cartilage to remove unattractive bumps from noses, reduces the size of pendulous breasts and builds up small ones. He can take the skin of a belly that is stretched out of shape and treat it like a seamstress treats a hem. He snips off excess skin and sews it back in place.

He applies carbolic acid to a face to peel off tiny wrinkles and sun spots, and then has the patient wait for new skin

to grow in.

Dr. Straith regards himself as "half engineer and half architect." That is because he has to estimate in advance how a project will look, and then build it according to his plans.

He has had some plastic surgery himself. His ears have been tucked back and he plans to have drooping eyelids improved "when I have a chance to lie down."

WHILE BETWEEN 10 and 15 percent of surgery

at Straith Hospital comes from problems caused by accident scars or trauma, most of his work is done for cosmetic reasons.

"I try to make people look normal so they can live a happy life," he said. "Happiness is the bottom line in this country. I've stopped telling people they can't have things done. If they are willing to take the risks, I'll go ahead. Society places a value on beauty, and who is to say society is wrong?"

"All children with some

abnormality should have it corrected before they start school, or even before they see themselves in a mirror. Then it won't affect their character or cause them to develop a complex about how they look."

As people get older, they become more worried about their looks, he said. Will they be able to compete in the job market or find a new mate, they wonder. But lately even members of the younger set are uneasy about their appearance.

"Young pretty women are beginning to come in to get things done," Dr. Straith commented. "One was a 26-year-old photographer's model with jowls. I turned her down on a face lift. But she persisted and it was done."

She got a lot of jobs after that."

THE MAJORITY of his patients are women, but the number of men is rising. A used car salesman told Dr. Straith he needed to have his drooping eyel-

ids repaired because "it's difficult to convince people I'm honest."

Several men trained as engineers wanted their broken noses fixed "because it would help them sell their ideas at work."

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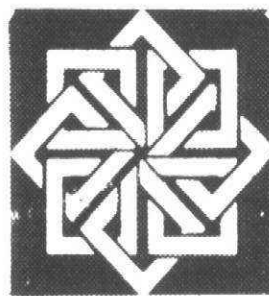


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2 artists will share exhibit

Stained glass is Wolf's medium. An intricately designed stained glass window, 4 by 9 feet, is the result of a year's effort by Wolf.



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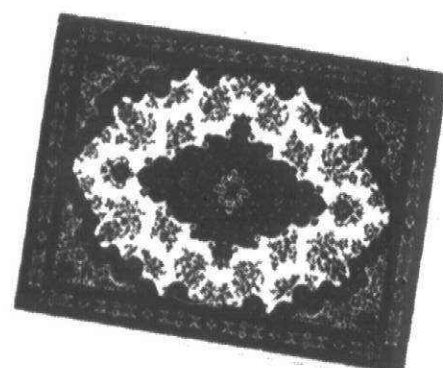
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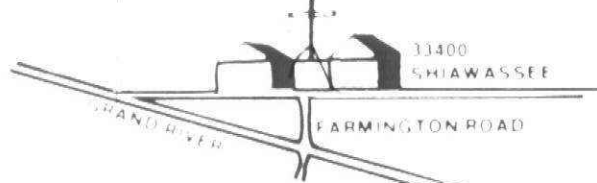
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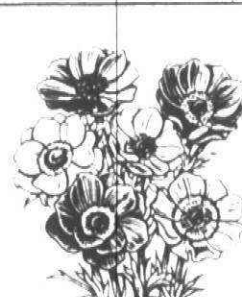

New library covers death, bereavement

Death and the way people deal with it is the topic of much recent writing. But despite the proliferation of books on the subject, available at the time of greatest need is often another matter.

A collection of books and tapes on the subject — as complete as a couple of interested funeral directors can make it — is offering a solution to the problem.

The Leonard Turowski Funeral Home, 9300 Middlebelt, Livonia, is making its collection available to the community, not only the bereaved but also those who come to the funeral home to offer condolences and students putting together papers on the subject. "We think it's the only one of its kind in these communities," said Turowski, who has worked with Milo Thomas, a member of the funeral home staff, to organize the collection.

A large bookshelf holding several hundred volumes is located in a small waiting room at the home.

"It's right near the coffee table for a reason," said Turowski. "We want people to use it while they are here. There are not any magazines lying around. We hope people will pick up one of these books and gain some understanding."

"Other books deal with suicide, prevention and adjustment when it happens. And there are quite a few for widows, giving them emotional support as well as practical information they need."

More books on the shelves deal with aging and the care of the aged. "That's an area in which there has been a great increase in interest," said Turowski. Still more get into theology and pastoral counseling.

Children and death represents still another subject covered.

"We have some for children, and some for parents, and some that they can read together," Turowski added.

THE BOOKS will be available to take home and read. "No fees, just like the library," said Thomas.

They also will be made available to any students who need them or papers and research projects. The public can use them too.

Planned for the future, after the public gets used to this library, will be a larger collection in a more private room, said Turowski.

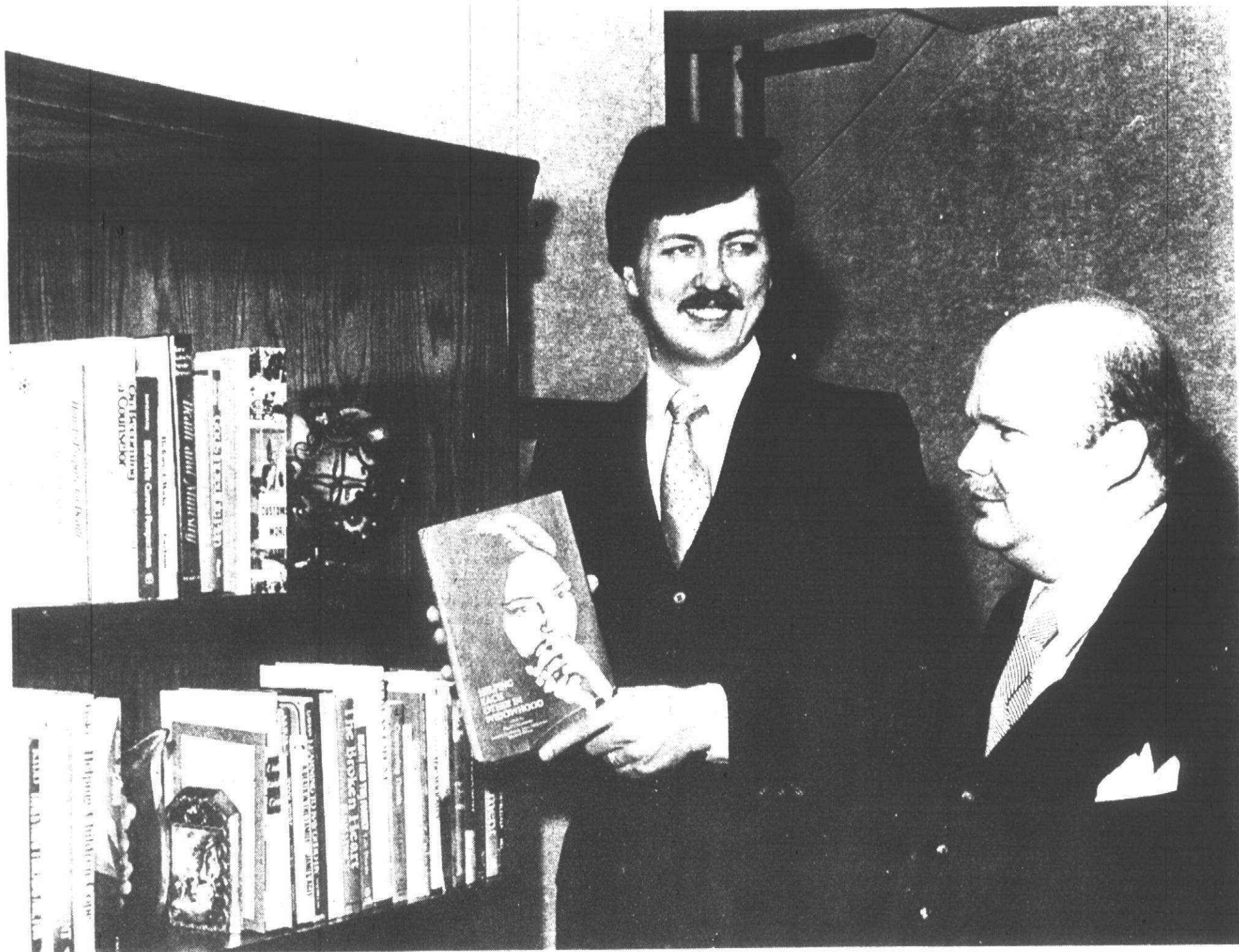
"We want to provide a more private resource center," he added. "This would be a place where people could sit down and be comfortable. It also could be used for some of the counseling we do."

The Turowski home has a set of films and a projector which is used both for counseling purposes on the premises and to take to area schools for special programs.

"We can put on a death education course for children," said Turowski. "Basically, it helps children better understand death and gives them a little preparation for the death of a loved one."

A WIDE variety of related subjects is covered in the mini-library, according to Thomas, who has read most of the books.

"There is information on the questions people ask about funerals, whether children should attend and what kind of service should be planned. That kind of information is what we as funeral directors want people to know about."

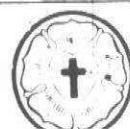

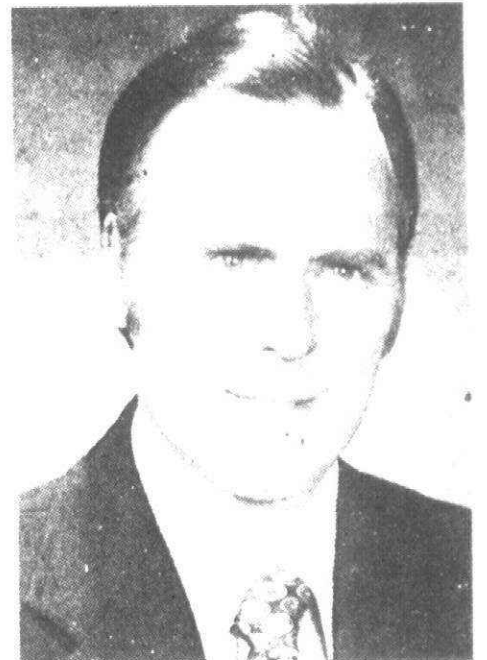

The next session will be Feb. 25 at Hulsing Elementary School.

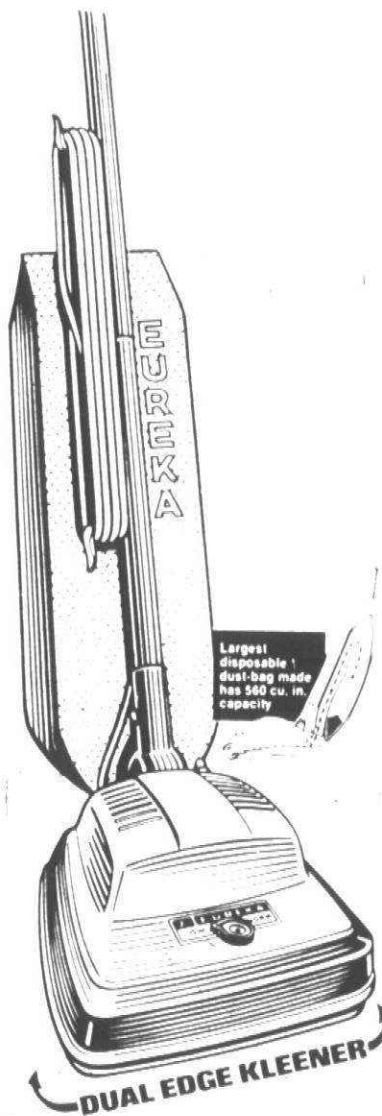
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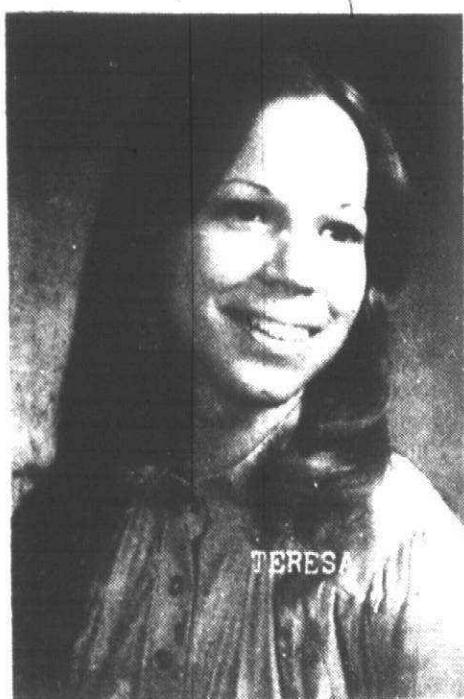

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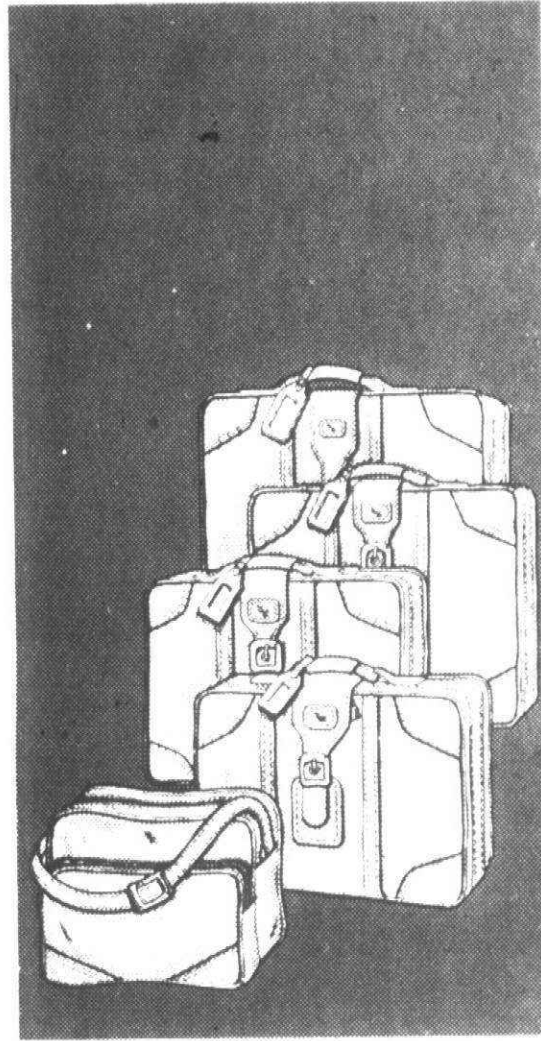
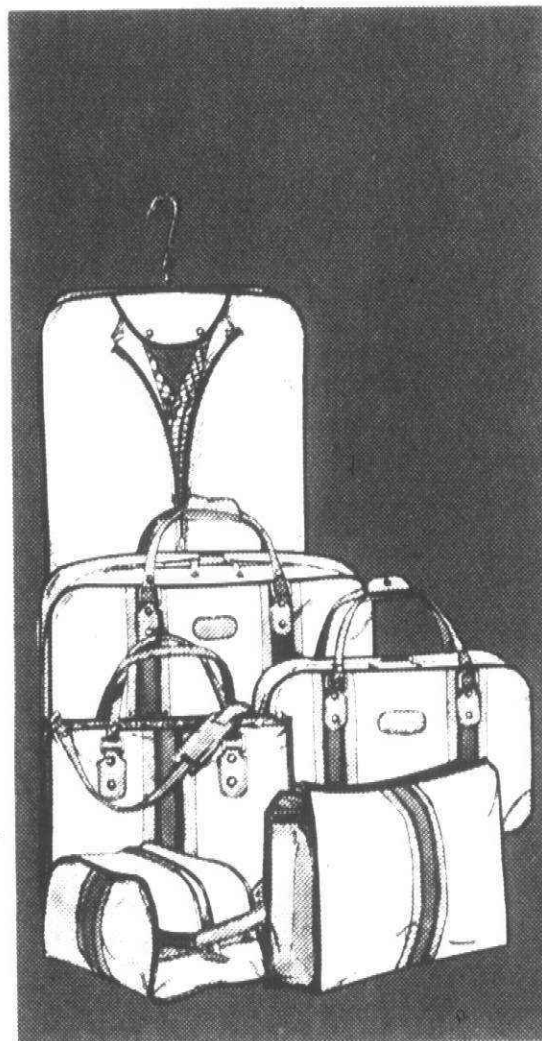
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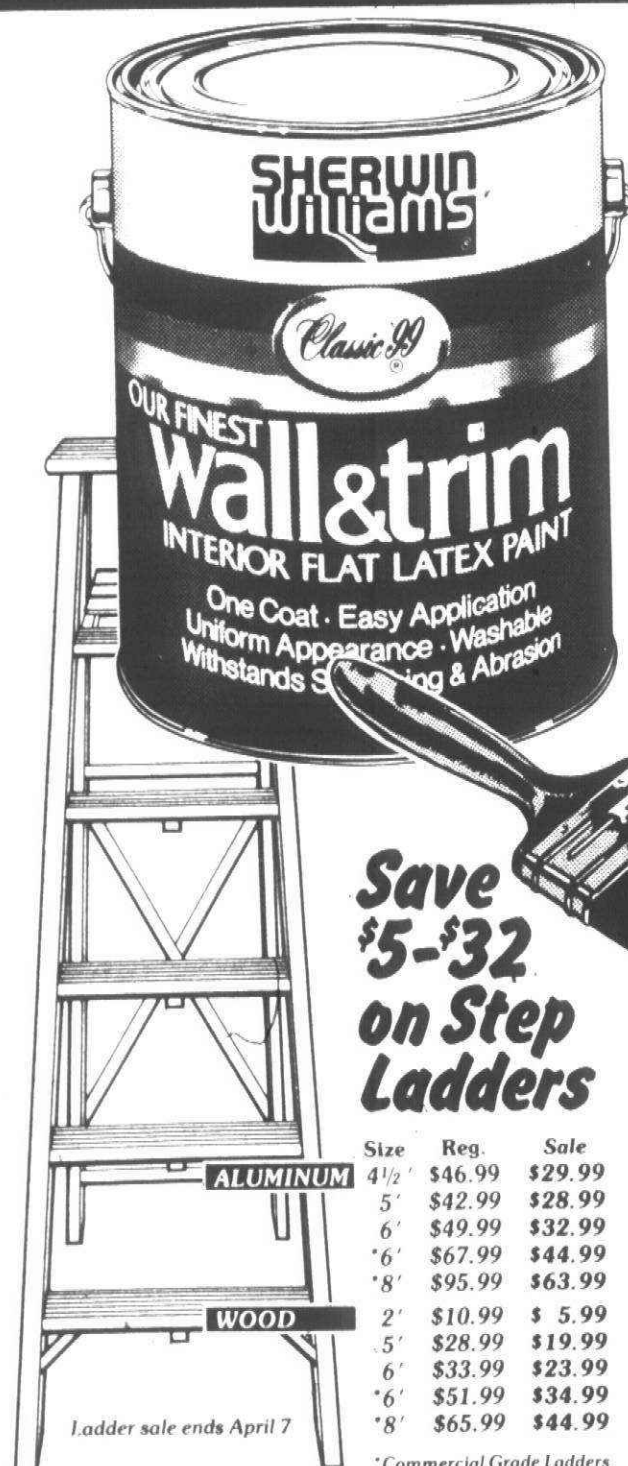
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International society of engineers holds regional meeting in Plymouth

The bells

Church tower carries the imprint of history

Frederick Marriott led the way up the narrow winding steps to the tower of the Kirk in the Hills Church. He has made the trip up the 108 steps many times. We were going to see Roy, Ruth, Royce Randall and Ruth Ann.

Halfway up, Marriott stopped and opened the door out to the main part of the tower. The cold wind whipped through the open windows as we got a look at Roy.

Roy is the six-ton bass or "bourdon" bell of the 77-bell carillon in the tower of the Kirk, a carillon which is the world's largest in the number of bells, on Long Lake Road in Bloomfield Township. Inscribed on the side of Roy, which is a G bell, is the verse "a faithful man shall abound with blessings."

Surrounding Roy in the tower are the other four swinging bells which make up the bass notes of the 68,900 pound carillon. They also bear quotations from the Book of Proverbs.

Ruth, the B bell, is inscribed with the verse "A woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised, her children arise up and call her blessed, her husband, also, and he praiseth her."

RANDALL, THE D BELL, is inscribed with "Randall, my son, Be wise, and make my heart glad."

The E bell bears the inscription "Royce, my son, Hear the instruction of thy father, and forsake not the law of thy mother."

The highest bell to be named is another G bell, on which is written "Ruth Ann, my daughter. Keep the heart with all diligence, for out of it are the issues of life."

After viewing the large bells, we climbed more of the narrow steps to the "clavier" located above the large bells and below the small ones.

From inside the second level of windows in the 187-foot tower, the carillonneur has a magnificent view of the surrounding area. Inside the heated cabin, the wooden levers that make up the keyboard or clavier, are located.

Marriott pulled out his "PGA specials," sat down at the bench, and using a motion with his fists began playing the carillon. The gloves are modified golf gloves, of which he had cut out the first three fingers and padded the last two.

"Because of the force it takes to play the levers, a carillonneur could damage his hands unless he wears some kind of protection," he said. "The sound of the bells is determined by how hard the lever is hit."

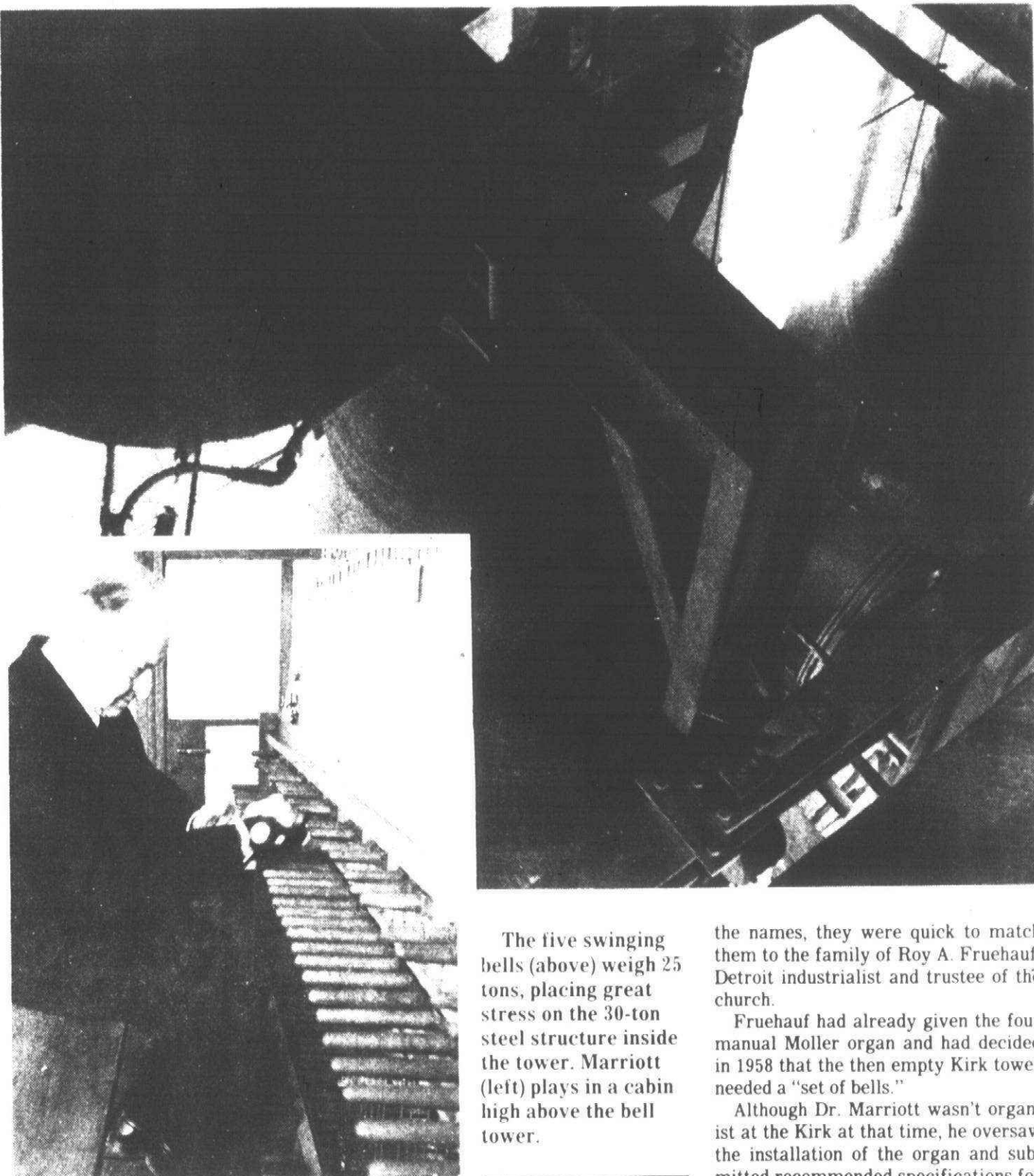
HE WENT ON TO explain the location of the keyboard. "Originally it was located at the bottom of the tower but the slack in the wires leading to the bells was so great that the response of the bells was sluggish," he said.

The wires at the top of the clavier each are attached to a wooden lever and to a bell clapper. When the lever is depressed, the clapper rings the bell.

Most of the bells have one clapper, but 32 of them have two clappers. This is because these bells have clappers controlled by a keyboard located next to the organ console.

The five swinging bells have three clappers, the third is electronically controlled by a timer which rings the bells regularly during the day.

For eight miles around the church, these five bells are heard daily as they

are tolled on the quarter hour, playing the Bell Motive from Wagner's "Parsifal."

At noon they remind everyone to continue to pray for the Americans still held hostage in Iran.

Twenty years ago last January, these bronze bells arrived on the lawn of Kirk in the Hills. The gift had been an anonymous one, but there was speculation as the donor.

WHEN THE PARISHIONERS saw

the names, they were quick to match them to the family of Roy A. Fruehauf, Detroit industrialist and trustee of the church.

Fruehauf had already given the four manual Moller organ and had decided in 1958 that the then empty Kirk tower needed a "set of bells."

Although Dr. Marriott wasn't organist at the Kirk at that time, he oversaw the installation of the organ and submitted recommended specifications for carillon.

So Fruehauf gave the order, and a 300-year old Dutch company Petit & Fritsen, Ltd., began casting the 77 bells, a process which took 14 months.

A play looks at brain damage

Cerebral palsy is a motor disorder which is due to a non-progressive abnormality of the brain. The original lesion must occur early in life.

The limits of this period are not defined, but it is agreed that abnormality of prenatal development, birth injuries and the consequences of infection or injury in childhood are included. The term also implies that no active disease exists at the time of diagnosis.

Characterized by loss of voluntary movement; specifically, an increase in spastic movement, uncontrolled action of either or both flexor and extensor muscles.

Emotional problems — may show immaturity, lack of intellectual development, dependency and have feelings of rejection.

Perceptual problems — inability to synthesize sight to brain communication.

Feeding and nutritional problems — inability to swallow normally and digestive problems.

Voice and articulation problems — speech is unclear or non-existent, owing to lack of coordination or spasticity of the tongue.

Briefly, this is what is in store for 10,000 children born each year with cerebral palsy. It is also in store for the parents of these children.

In varying degrees and formulas, one in every 210 children born in this country will suffer from this disorder. This works out to a population of 750,000.

"A Day in the Life of Joe Egg," a play written by Peter Nichols, is about one of these children. The Theater Guild of Livonia-Redford opens Friday with this heart-rending play for a three-week run.

PRESENTED AS a comedy, it is in reality a tragic look at the effect on a marriage of two very common, very nice, very scared parents. For 10 years, they have raised their daughter Joe as best they could.

They live in a world where sick humor is the only relief from the strain, for not to make jokes would lead to the child's removal to an institution.

Dale Feldpausch plays Brian, the father, who does burlesque sketches to hide his real emotions.

"He clowns to keep sane," Feldpausch says. "He is a character escaping from Joe, escaping from the hurt he feels inside."

"And in the end he tries to escape by letting Joe die, and when even that fails he must leave."

This is a play filled with innuendos and what is known in the trade as sub-text. played for the jokes and openly wild, there is an unmistakable meaning to every line. Each of the actors must first make us laugh but, more importantly, make us understand the depth of their problem.

Sandi Martin plays Joe's mother, Sheila. "It's one of the hardest parts I've ever had to play," she says.

"Sheila and Brian never really talk about the problem; they jab at it, poke fun at it. Each in their own way deals with it as best they can."

IT IS NOT easy to say how a child like this should be treated. In our humanitarian world, it is very easy to say that the child should be loved and cared for.

But after 10 years of changing diapers, after endless medical bills, after 10 years of never hearing your child call you Momma or Papa, after never being able to leave the child alone even for a couple of hours, after years of epileptic fits ... might not the

strain be too much for a marriage to withstand?

Whose fault was it, anyway? Was it an act of God or did I do something wrong?

From a theatrical point of view, this is no small undertaking. Director Ron Worsley has assembled a powerful cast including nine-year-old Michael Hineman as Joe Egg.

"In real life, I'm like a monkey, I always want to move around," she says. "It's very hard sitting in the wheelchair for so long."

"I'm not supposed to move; I can't even watch the others with my eyes. I'm not supposed to be able to see things too good."

Joe, who is written as a complete vegetable, is not an easy part. But then the play is not easy.

HOW DO YOU find the emotion to be caught in such a situation?

"Well, you try to internalize it, but you really can't," Ms. Martin says. "I don't think anyone could say just how they would handle a child such as this. No one could until they had to do it."

Feldpausch agrees. "I don't have any children, in fact I'm not married yet," he says. "Cynical humor is hard to do for someone else. You see, Brian and Sheila mean no harm — especially Sheila, for her hope springs eternal — but Brian has given up."

"It's so sad that humor is the only way to handle it."

Caution to make the joes funny but not cruel is a fine point that director Worsley will have to deal with. It is not often that plays of this sophistication and worth are seen in community theater.

"Joe Egg" is being performed Feb. 15, 16, 22-24, 29 and March 1 at the Guild's playhouse, 15138 Beech Daly just south of Five Mile. Curtain is at 8:30 p.m., except for the 2:30 p.m. matinee on Feb. 24.

Bells are ringin' for Fred Marriott

"I am partial to Dutch bells and had recommended them because I felt Pet-it & Fritsen had the best skill for tuning bells," said Marriott, now organist and carillonneur at the Kirk. "They follow the method used by the Hemony family."

Tuning bronze cast bells is a fine skill that was developed by the Hemony family in Holland in the 1600s but became a lost art when the company ceased production in 1678.

In the late 1800s, the English bell foundry, now known as Gillett and Johnston, rediscovered the art. This discovery led to the renaissance of bells.

MARRIOTT CONSIDERED both firms, as well as a French firm, but preferred the Dutch company, advice which was followed by the Kirk.

Bell tuning is complicated because bells ring a chord instead of a single note. The entire chord must be in tune.

For instance, when a bell is tolled or hit by a clapper, the neck of the C bell will ring a C while a little further up the sound will be an E flat and still higher up the sound will be G, while at the top of the bell the sound will be a C one octave higher.

The lip of the bell is where the "hum" sound is produced. This note is one octave lower than the original sound and will last longer than the other notes. In other words, the C bell will sound a C minor chord.

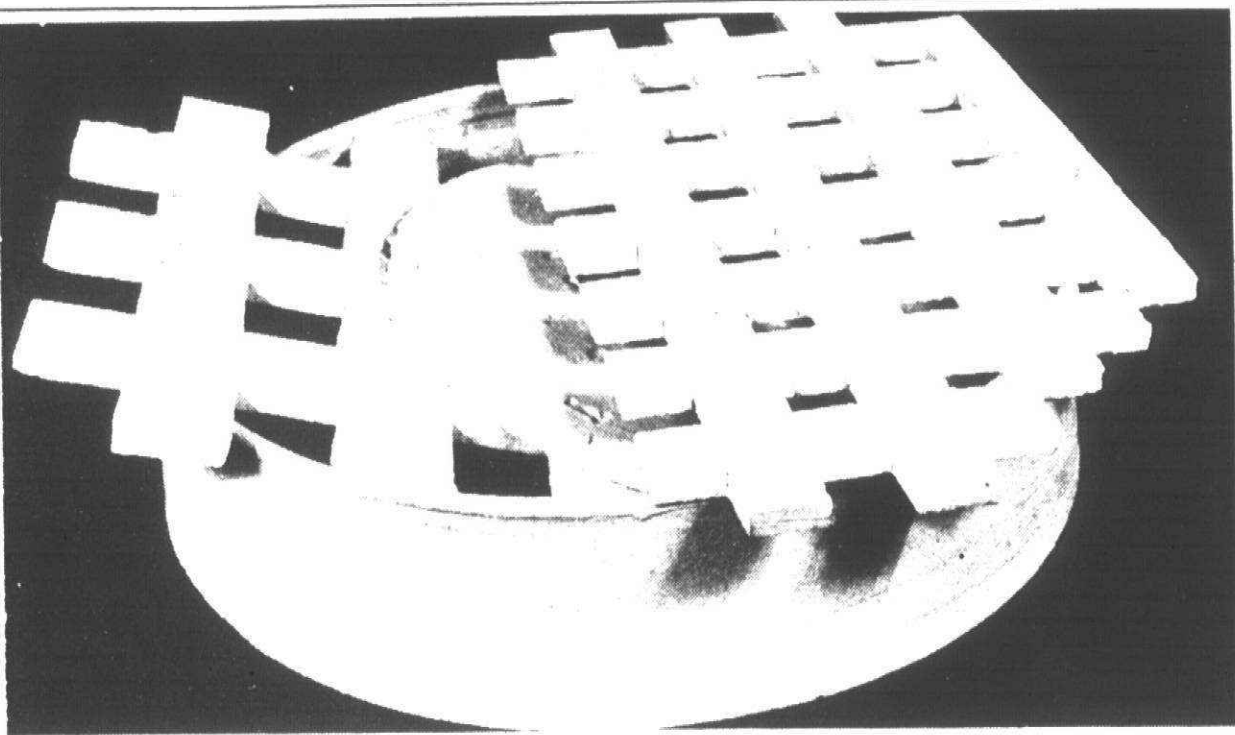
"People say the bells are out of tune, but it is the way they are played," said Marriott. He went on to explain the knowledge required of a carillonneur of the harmonic chord structure of each bell in order to gain the best possible bell combinations.

THROUGH THE AGES, bells have been a symbol of festivals and joyous occasions as well as times of sorrow. The same is true of the bells at the Kirk. They are played at weddings, church services, funerals, and concerts.

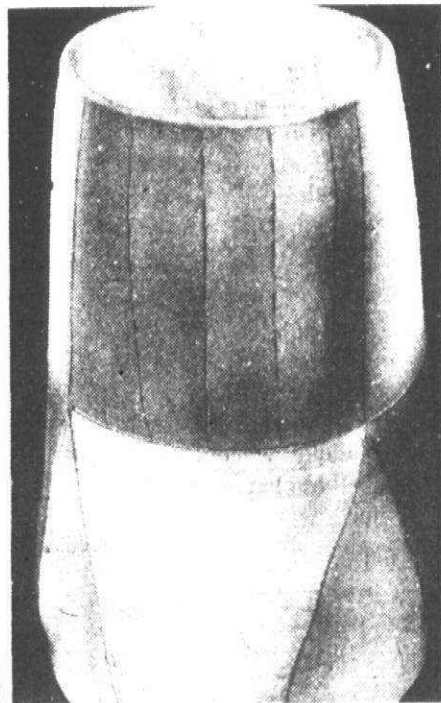
At Christmas and Easter they chime melodiously, always reflecting the joyous spirit of the times. On Good Friday, the "bourdon" bell is tolled 33 times for the years of Christ's life, a custom that originated in the lowlands of Europe.

With constant use, the stress of the 25 tons of the five swinging bells on the 30-ton steel structure inside the tower is considerable. Consequently, the structure needs constant upkeep and has to be checked regularly.

Marriott is no stranger to carillons. During the last 50 years, he has played every major carillon in the world.

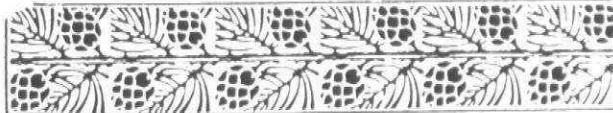
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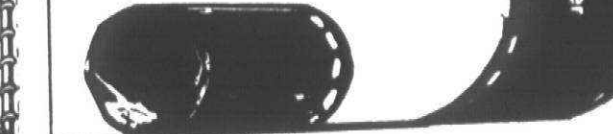
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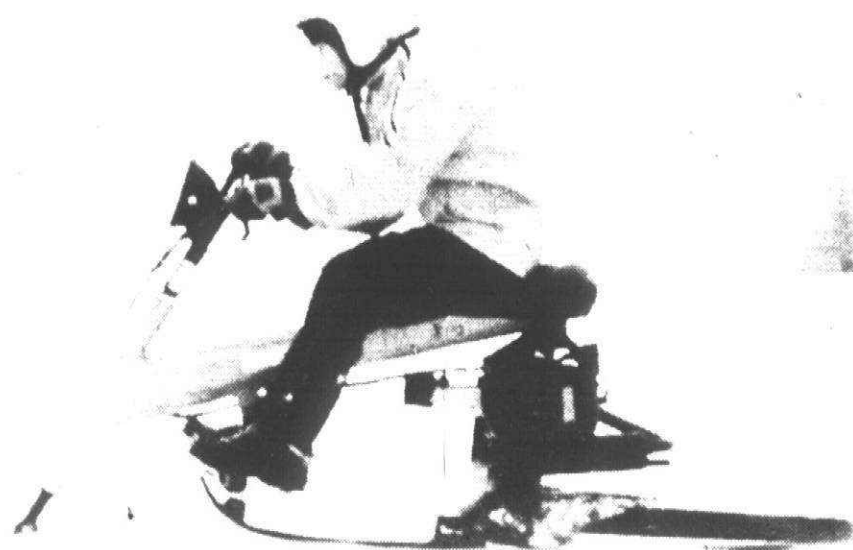

Off-road vehicles

A serious hazard to the environment

"Snowmobiles, dune buggies, trail bikes and other such machines, improperly used, can harm vegetation, wildlife and watersheds, and conflict with backpackers, cross country skiers and other users of public land."

That quote comes from the announcement of a conference in Ann Arbor March 17-18 to review U.S. Department of Agriculture policies for off-road vehicles (ORVs).

Not only can they do harm. They *do* do harm. USDA manages our national forests, four of which are in Michigan. Co-sponsors of the conference are USDA and the University of Michigan.

The theory of ORV owners seems to be: "I spent good money on this machine, and now the government owes me a place to run it. I got my rights."

Yet any lover of the woods has to know what kind of damage ORVs do:

- Hillsides torn up by trail bikes and subjected to erosion.
- Vegetation mowed down.
- Animals spooked from their otherwise inaccessible habitats.
- Ice fishing ruined by the vibrations and racket from snowmobiles.

ORVs are great tools. Somewhere I read that the snowmobile was invented by a Quebec man whose son died in a rural cabin because a doctor couldn't get there. Conservation officers, cops and mailmen ought to have them when they need them.

But as toys? Conference speakers will include academic types, user groups, non-user groups, state and federal agencies.

If you're interested in attending, contact: U-M Extension Service, Department of Conferences and Institutes, 412 Maynard, Ann Arbor 48109.

Don't expect anyone to recommend outlawing ORVs. Says the announcement: "The conference

will focus on improved ORV management to protect environmental values and minimize conflicts of use. A major thrust will be to review USDA policies and provide recommendations for improved department compliance with two executive orders."

MORE THAN 800 recreational vehicles and exhibits will be on display at the Detroit Camper and Travel Trailer show opening Friday and running until Feb. 24 at the Detroit Artillery Armory, W. Eight Mile near Northland.

The trend of last year will continue: lighter-vehicles that can be towed by smaller cars with less consumption of gasoline.

Hours are 6-10 p.m. Friday, Feb. 15; noon to 10 p.m. both Saturdays and the first Sunday; 2-10 p.m. weekdays; and noon to 8 p.m. the final Sunday.

The album is a multi-disc set consisting of three records featuring Welsh soprano Gwyneth Jones in the title role. It is supported by an international cast along with Detroit's Kenneth Jewell Choral.

Writing in the British trade publication "Gramophone," London Times music critic William Mann stated that Dorati "gives the score all its dynamic grandeur and its lyricism," and that "the Detroit orchestral soloists, particularly woodwind, horn, and violin, all acquit themselves eloquently, and the choruses are strongly projected."

The opera was recorded in Detroit's United Artists Theatre last spring after performances in Detroit, Washington's Kennedy Center and New York's Carnegie Hall where it received a 20-minute standing ovation.

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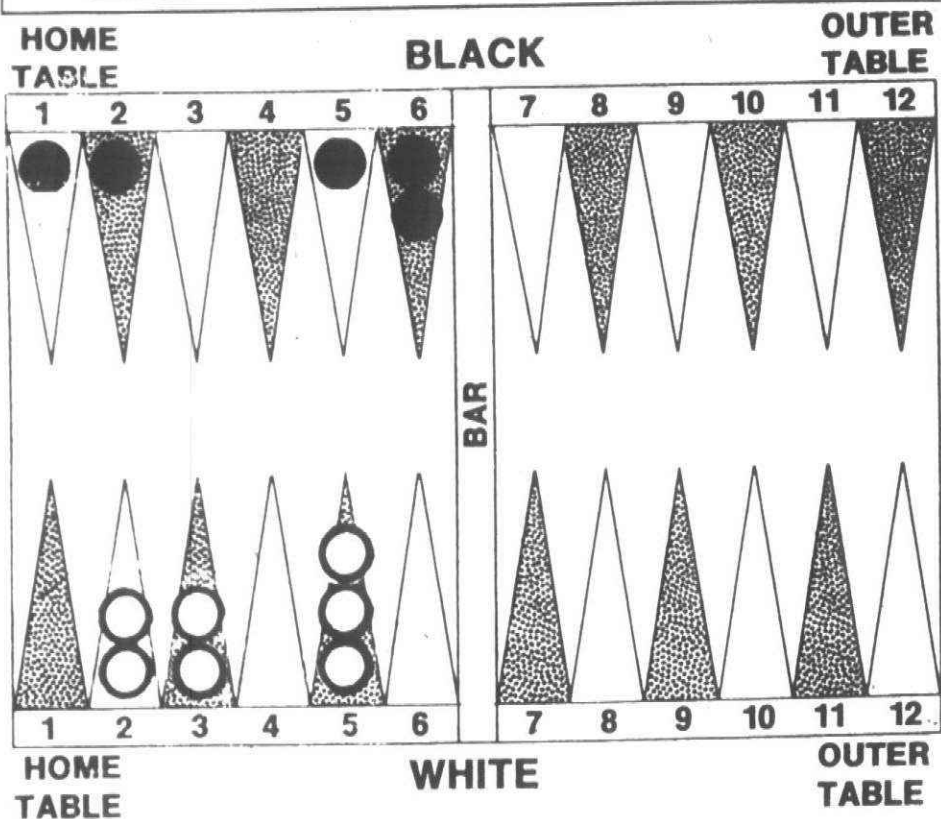

BEARING OFF

Very often during the bearing-off (end) stage of a game, critical decisions have to be made. Players can either bear off checkers at the expense of the resulting board position or pass up a chance to bear off men in order to maximize the distribution of remaining checkers.

In the finals of an ABC championship tournament, this board position appeared. Three rolls earlier, white had a definite advantage and doubled the cube.

Shortly after accepting, black rolled double fives, appears to have captured a slight lead in the bear-off race, and is contemplating redoubling the cube. In this position, white has rolled double ones.

First temptation might be to bear off both checkers from the 2 point, leaving the 1, 2 and 4 points open. This move, however, could prove disaster rous in the next few rolls. Removing two men still leaves five checkers (requiring

three rolls) to bear off. Black also needs three good rolls but has the 3 and 4 points open.

With several interesting playable options, white recognizes the removal of one man is a must and that proper distribution is important.

White removed one man from the 2, leaving six checkers to bear off and moved two checkers from the 5 to the 4 point. Now the only bad number is one, and the distribution potential has increased 100 percent.

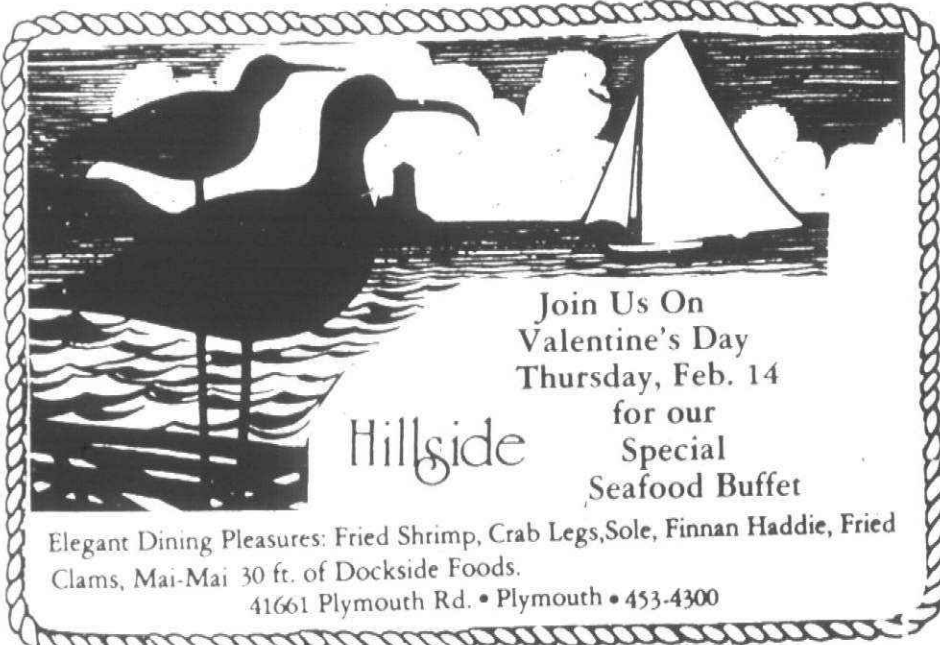
White could have moved one checker from 5 to 4, and one from 3 to 2 or one from 2 to 1 (which is not as terrible), but white chose the proper play.

IN THE GAME . . .

During the final bear-off, black never redoubled. After stripping the 1 and 2 point, black missed on two rolls.

White was the winner.

The cast also includes Larry Hovis from television's "Hogan's Heroes;" William Hardy from the original production in Houston.

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
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

Analyzing escalating prices

No, this is not an article about getting buzzed on wine, nor is it dedicated to the insolent wine steward in some slick restaurant. These worthy topics await later columns.

This is a review of the radically escalating prices of wine on our merchants' shelves.

Anyone buying wine regularly over the last couple of years has to be aghast at the increased wallet pain we have experienced. And it has not been restricted to any one wine region. All have gone up dramatically.

One way — certainly not the only — of calculating the cost of wine is to tally the cost of each type on a merchant's shelves. Thus, if you must have a Zinfandel, what is your choice range?

I recently reviewed the shelves of two eastern Oakland County wine stores, both large and excellent, and tallied the costs of the cork-finished, major varietals from California.

I confined my sleuthing to California entries because of their relative homogeneity. The range of issues for these is less than, say Bordeaux, and there tends to be enough of each of the major varietals to develop a picture.

Again, Gallo and Swiss Colony were not counted, but Pedroncelli, Masson and Christian Brothers were. The figures are interesting if one can get by the shock.

TO READ the "standard deviation" column, subtract and add that value to the value in the "mean" column to find the range of the middle two-thirds of the price distribution.

Hence, two-thirds of the Chenin Blancs on the shelf cost between \$4.64 and \$6.64. One-sixth cost more

than \$6.64. And one-sixth of the Chardonnays cost more than \$13.57 and only one-sixth of the Cabernets cost less than \$6.42.

Drinking cork-finished wines from California (and France and Germany) is clearly not inexpensive. It will be interesting to report to you in a year what changes we'll see. It's not difficult to anticipate the direction they'll all go and that the whites, especially Chardonnay, will be nearly out of sight by then.

This tale has no moral, alas.
