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Train kills man at disputed rail crossing

A 39-year-old Canton man was killed by an Amtrak passenger train Monday morning at a railroad crossing which the state wants to close.

Ronald Barry, of 42004 Van Born, was pronounced dead at the scene by a representative of the Wayne County Medical Examiner's Office. Barry's truck was moving across the tracks at

the Lilley Road crossing when hit by the train, according to the Wayne County Sheriff's department.

An Amtrak engineer said he tried unsuccessfully to stop the train after sighting Barry's panel truck, according to Detective Gerald Murphy of the sheriff's department.

The crossing is marked only by a stop sign and railroad symbol. A view of the straight track at the crossing is

unobstructed by trees.

Lou Sugo of the Wayne County Road Commission said his agency requested safety improvements at the crossing in January 1979. But the request has been shelved pending the outcome of a Michigan Department of Transportation proposal to close the crossing.

None of the estimated 100 passengers on board the Chicago-bound train were injured in the accident, according

to Debbie Marceniak, a spokeswoman for Amtrak headquarters in Washington.

She estimated damages to the power car of the train at \$30,000.

BUDDY DEACONS, a neighbor of Barry's, said the accident victim was a self-employed auto, truck and heavy equipment mechanic. Deacons said

Barry and his wife, Chris, have three children.

Barry was driving the truck which he used for work at 9 a.m. Monday when the accident occurred. The Lilley Road railroad crossing is near his home in the southern end of Canton Township.

A dispute over the continued existence of the crossing has sidelined a road commission offer to pay \$25,000 toward the installation of a gate and flashing signal at the site. Conrail, which owns the tracks in that area,

would be obligated to pay an additional \$25,000 for the safety improvements.

But Clarence Magoon, a special staff assistant for the railroad safety section of the Michigan Department of Transportation, said no safety improvements will be ordered for at least four to five months.

He expects it will take the state that long to dispose of its own proposal to close the crossing.

Firm drops plan for foster home

A licensing request for an adult foster care home in the Canton County Acres subdivision was withdrawn Tuesday after the owner of the home changed his mind about a lease agreement.

Ray Nichols of Alternative Services said his firm will now search for another home to house six mentally retarded adults. The clients now live in the Northville Residential Training Center on Seven Mile Road.

"But whether the home will be in Canton or not is another story," Nichols said.

Alternative Services and NRTC proposed locating the adult foster care center in an existing colonial home in the subdivision south of Palmer and east of Morton Taylor. A licensing application was pending before the Department of Social Services.

But Nichols said the owner of the home contacted NRTC officials two weeks ago to say he had changed his mind about leasing the home to Alternative Services.

Nichols theorizes that community pressure led to the owner's change of heart. Residents voiced opposition to the proposal at a neighborhood meeting earlier this month.

Alternative Services, a non-profit corporation based in Royal Oak, would have operated the proposed home jointly with NRTC. Residents of the home had not been selected.

Similar foster care proposals for mentally retarded youths are still pending before the Department of Social Services. Those plans call for construction of homes on Maben and Herbey. The homes would be operated by Pyramid Human Services, a non-profit corporation based in Ann Arbor.

Mentally retarded, ill, harbored

14 adults call this house home

They lounge in the living room to chat and watch the next episode of their favorite soap operas. Some enjoy a friendly game of gin rummy or chess. One woman spends her time on needlework to brighten the tiny room she shares on the second floor.

"They" are the mentally retarded and mentally ill residents of a 52-year-old house on Warren Road.

The home has been operating quietly on a treed, five-acre lot between Hagerty and Lotz since 1975.

The turbulent emotions which have greeted proposals for similar homes in other areas of Canton Township seem foreign to this semi-rural setting where neighborhood children mold bricks of

ice in the front yard.

Live-in owner John Wiltzie says neighborhood opposition never surfaced here.

His father, James, used the building as a nursing home from 1962 to 1968. When state regulations governing nursing homes stiffened, the elder Wiltzie leased the building to the proprietors of a boarding house.

Wiltzie said neighbors were glad when he decided to purchase the home from his father in 1975 and establish a foster care home for 14 adults.

"Being an owner, they thought I would take better of the house," Wiltzie explained. "It had fallen into disrepair."

THE 30-YEAR-OLD Wiltzie sleeps in

an attic room above the sprawling seven-bedroom house.

He performs the administrative tasks for the business in between card games and friendly chats with residents. Three employees, including a "live-in" worker with two school-age sons, do most of the cooking and cleaning with a dash of help from residents.

"It's a hard lifestyle," Wiltzie admitted. "You have zero privacy, and you certainly can't have parties for your friends or entertain."

"But you really have to be here. It's 24-hour care, and the only time emergencies seem to crop up is in the middle of the night. It's good for clients to have the authority figure always here."

Judy Ficia, who handles the bulk of meal responsibilities, says living in an adult foster care home "has been a real education" for her children, ages 7 and 10.

"I hope they grow up and not be prejudiced against people with a problem," she said. "They accept these people as family."

Wiltzie's clients range in age from 28 to 60, with most in the 40 to 60 age bracket. There are currently five women and nine men living in the home which is licensed by the Michigan Department of Social Services for 14.

According to Wiltzie, all his clients lived in state institutions before moving to the house on Warren Road. Most are mentally retarded. But a few were institutionalized for exhibiting minor, non-violent signs of schizophrenia.

Wiltzie sympathizes with a growing drive of the Michigan Mental Health Department to deinstitutionalize such clients and provide more home-like settings.

BUT HE EXHIBITS a visible irritation with the state when asked about three proposals before the Department of Social Services for foster care homes in Canton.

One plan calls for the construction of homes on Maben and Herbey for the

Census committee seeks way to get all residents counted

Everybody counts when it comes to getting federal money.

That's why a local complete count committee has been formed to insure that the 1980 U.S. census will get an accurate total of Canton residents.

Members of this committee were scheduled to hold a public informational meeting Wednesday, Feb. 20, at which the mechanics behind the massive census-taking effort would be explained.

The idea seems to be to get civic leaders and community organizations behind the effort to insure an accurate head count.

Supervisor Noel Culbert said he believes Canton's population will top 51,000 in the upcoming census. The last 1970 U.S. census listed Canton's popula-

tion at 11,025. A local census conducted in 1975 found the population at more than 26,000.

The supervisor said the 51,000 figure was arrived at by totaling the number of dwelling units in Canton — 12,000 houses and condominiums, 4,000 apartments and 1,882 mobile homes.

"Actually, 51,000 is pretty conservative even if you only figure on three people per household," Culbert said.

Terry Carroll, grants coordinator for the township and recording secretary for the complete count committee, said a population of more than 50,000 will entitle Canton to more federal money.

"We will be able to go for direct entitlement community development block grants and of course will get more federal revenue sharing benefits," Carroll said.

He added that Canton could also become a program agent for federal Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) money.

The complete count committee, chaired by Gary Sands, will attempt to get the residents interested enough to return their mailed census questionnaires.

Its major function, however, will be to check the initial population figures obtained by the census bureau in a process called a post-census review.

According to Carroll, if Canton disputes the figures, a drive to get more accurate figures for the section in question could be conducted.

Bill Shreck of the census bureau's re-

gional office in Detroit said the first census questionnaires will be received by households about March 28.

Every sixth home on the list will get a more detailed questionnaire, Shreck said.

Persons who do not mail the questionnaires back will be visited by a census taker.

Shreck said the census will employ some 275,000 persons nationwide and cost \$1 billion over 10 years.

He said questionnaires were mailed to about 60 percent of the households nationwide in 1970, with the figure going to 90 percent this year. Official state counts have to be prepared by January, 1981, Shreck said, but unofficial figures will be circulated earlier.

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Training coming in life saving

Free courses will be offered in March to train residents to become certified cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) instructors.

The two free courses are being offered by the American Red Cross in cooperation with the community educa-

tion department of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

CPR is a life-saving technique which combines mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and external cardiac compression to restore breathing and heartbeat until the victim revives or until professional help is obtained.

Both courses will be conducted March 4, 6, 11, 13 and 20 at Plymouth Canton High School on Canton Center Road just south of Joy. The daytime course will be from noon to 4 p.m. and the evening course from 6-10.

The training will be provided by qualified American Red Cross instructors from the Southeastern Michigan Chapter.

Students who complete one of the courses will be eligible to teach the emergency lifesaving technique.

The Red Cross estimates about 50 percent of victims of cardiac arrest can be saved if help is received within the first four minutes of arrest.

Because of the importance of CPR, the community education department has been offering training to adults in the community.

David Dursum, community education director, says the CPR classes offered are filled up and he feels more

adults would enroll if additional classes could be scheduled.

Right now more classes cannot be scheduled, Dursum says, because there aren't enough trained volunteer instructors available.

The purpose of the March classes being offered by the Red Cross is to line up more qualified instructors to increase CPR instructions to adults.

Dursum also hopes to take the instruction directly to community groups once enough instructors are available.

Currently CPR training is part of the health education curriculum for all ninth-graders at both Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools.

The CPR training program was instituted after a donation of equipment and instructional materials by the Rotary Club of Plymouth. Rotarians made the donation in hopes that all members of the community could become trained in the life-saving technique.

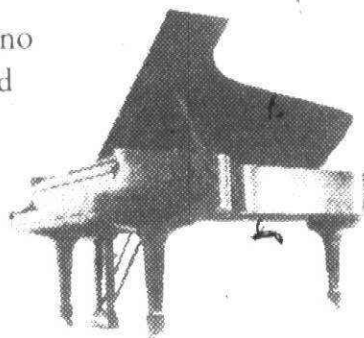

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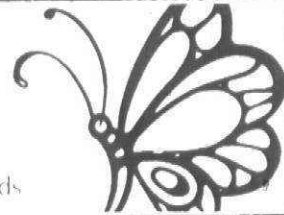
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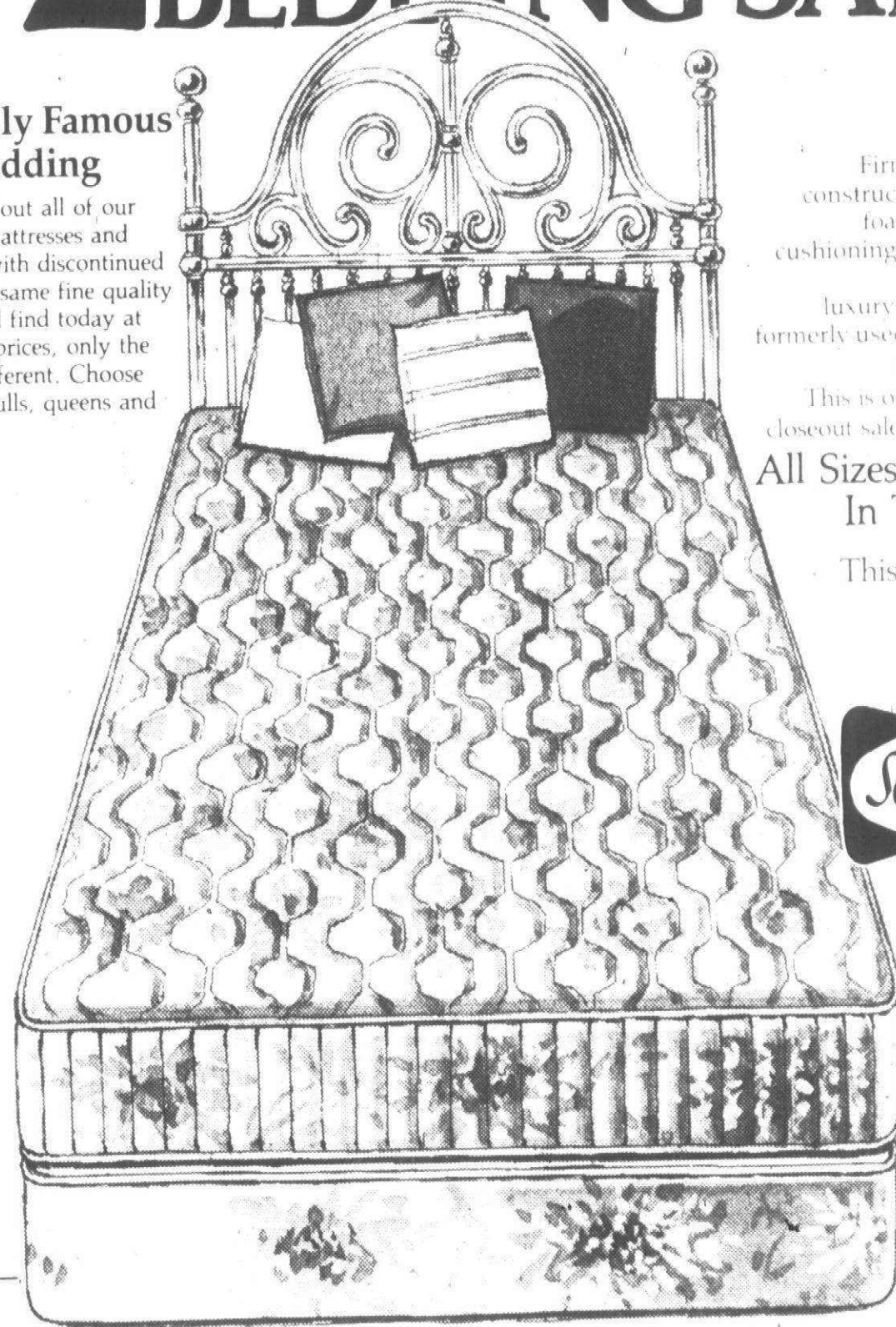

care of mentally retarded youths. Another called for the establishment of an adult foster care home in the Canton Country Acres subdivision. That application, however, has been withdrawn.

Non-profit corporations, which operate a string of such homes, would run the facilities under supervision of the state.

A spokesperson for the Northville Residential Training Center, which will select clients for the adult foster care home, said the state will pay the corporations a daily fee of \$40 to \$60 for each client.

But Wiltzie said the state pays him only \$13 a day for each of the clients he supervises. Two years ago, state audi-

tors recommended an increase to \$20 a day. But Wiltzie says he has never seen a penny of the recommended fee hike.

"I think this program they want to put in Canton is a taxpayer rip-off," Wiltzie said. "And I can't blame the people for protesting." Wiltzie advocates the establishment of more homes like his in rural settings. He questions the wisdom of placing the mentally retarded in subdivisions "where they have to supervised very carefully."

WILTZIE SAYS the adult foster care business has its ups and downs.

He must smooth the difficult transition period for residents when they first arrive from institutions. He sometimes is asked to smooth quarrels between clients with clashing personalities.

Last Christmas Day, "everyone was cranky" until Wiltzie handed out the presents, he said.

Wiltzie expects to leave the adult foster care business someday. He claims he needs at least \$20 a day for each client in order to operate at a profit. Right now, he says he is barely making ends meet.

But Wiltzie, who earned a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Michigan, said he entered the adult foster care business because of a long-time interest in the retarded.

Although he expects that none of his clients will ever be able to live on their own, Wiltzie says he enjoys watching their progress.

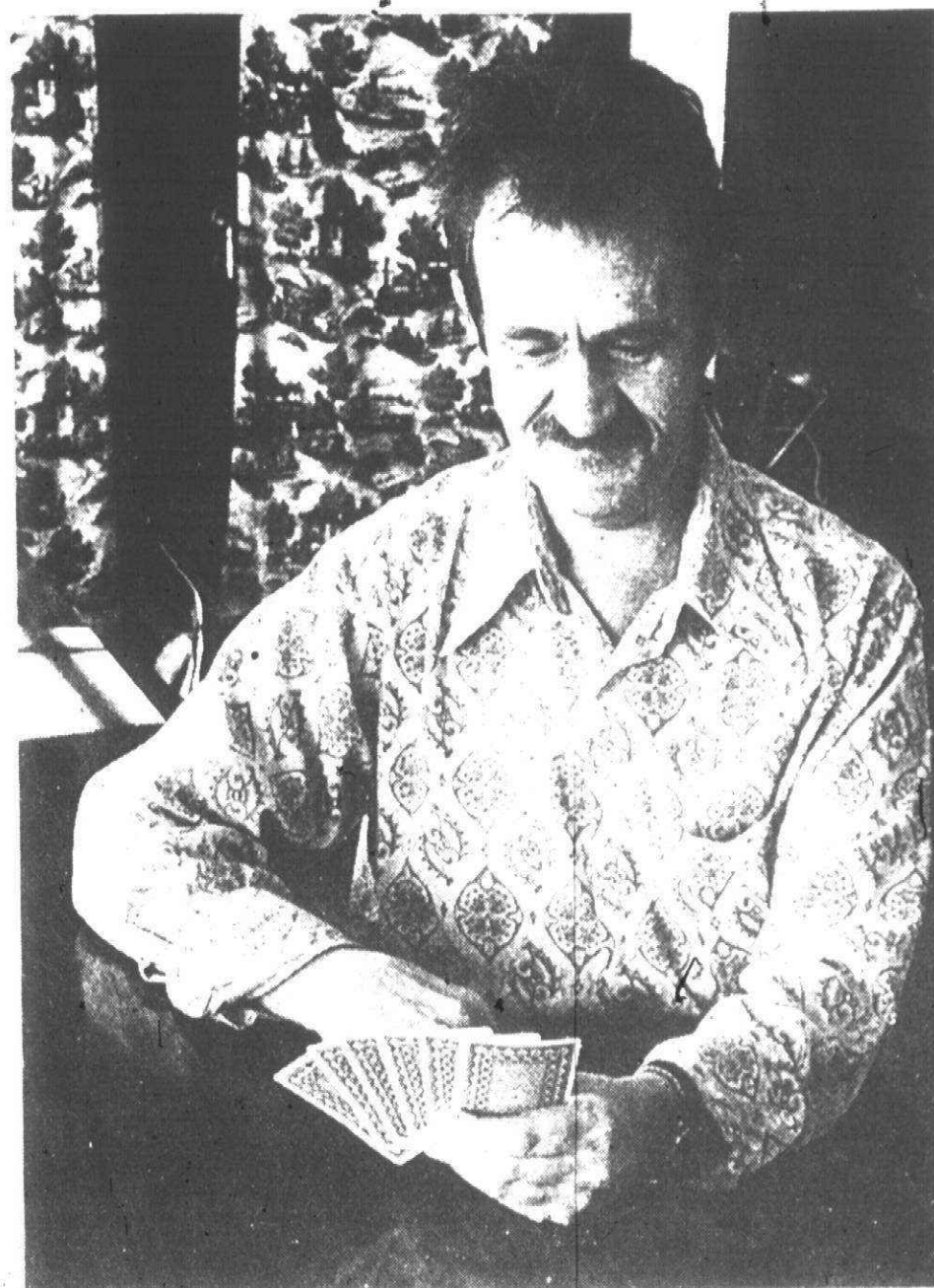
Special education instructors from the Wayne-Westland School District visit the home three days a week to offer instruction in reading, current events and arts and crafts. Many residents attend programs of the Easter Seal Society and sessions on self-care in Inkster.

Wiltzie is required to complete 30 hours of adult foster classes each year in order to retain his operating license. The classes are sponsored by the Michigan Department of Social Services.

He said his clients are transferred to nursing homes if health problems develop. The home is not equipped to handle physical disabilities.

Magoon said Conrail supports the state's position to barricade the crossing on grounds that Lilley Road traffic does not warrant a \$50,000 expenditure for safety improvements. Magoon maintains that alternative routes in the area can easily handle the street's traffic.

But Canton Township and the Wayne

County Road Commission vehemently oppose the plan.

Township officials maintain that barricading Lilley would impede the access of fire and other emergency vehicles to the area.

"Anytime we have a road, we want to keep it open," said Sugo of the road commission's stance.

Sugo said the commission asked for safety improvements at the crossing

more than a year ago as part of a county-wide review of railroad crossings.

MAGOON SAID Barry's death will probably bear little influence on the state's upcoming decision on the future of the crossing.

"It's an unfortunate incident," he said of Monday's accident. "But, in this case, unfortunately, the driver didn't pay attention to what he might have

been able to see."

Magoon said a March 10 conference has been scheduled in Lansing to discuss the Lilley Road case.

Ms. Marceciak said the train involved in Monday's accident was backed into Amtrak's Dearborn station following the incident. The estimated 100 passengers on board were transferred to another train bound for Chicago after a three-hour delay.

Punchcard voting speeds up process

Clerk John Flodin expects fewer operational headaches during election year 1980.

Flodin — the man in charge of counting ballots and insuring smooth precinct operations — says a \$6,000 expenditure for a partial switch to the punchcard voting system should work better than Bayer on election nights this year.

The clerk vividly remembers Nov. 7, 1978, when 24 precinct workers labored for 27 hours on the single task of tabulating absentee ballots. Two years before that, election results were not finalized until 6 a.m. because of the vast number of absentee ballots which were submitted.

Under the procedure used at that time, it took precinct workers four minutes to process a single absentee ballot. Votes on the paper ballots had to be registered on machines as if the precinct worker were casting his or her own vote.

But the new punchcard system will automatically tabulate about 100 absentee ballots a minute, Flodin said. That will mean faster results on election night and a need for fewer precinct workers, who earn \$3.50 to \$4 an hour.

The \$6,000 system, which the township board approved last week, will be used only for absentee ballots. But Flodin says the system could lead eventually to a complete switch to the punchcard system.

Under the procedure, voters use a stylus and card to punch out a hole next to their candidate selections. At the polls, the procedure takes place in private booths. Absentee voters may punch out the cards at home.

The paper absentee ballots have snarled Canton's election process during the past few years.

Election law stipulates that voters may cast absentee ballots for only certain reasons, such as their age or expectations to be out of town.

But during the last two November elections, local candidates staging write-in campaigns urged citizens to vote absentee. Former Supervisors Robert Greenstein and Harold Stein campaigned for write-in votes in the 1974 and 1976 elections after losing in the Democratic primary.

Flodin said those campaigns contributed to the high number of absentee ballots which were submitted. He added, however, that voting absentee seems to be a new trend in the election process throughout Michigan.

In the 1978 election, 1,800 of 17,000 registered voters cast absentee ballot. Flodin, who expects a high number of absentee ballot in this year's election, pegs Canton's current registered population at 22,000 voters.

The new system, which will be purchased from Computer Election System of California, should be in working order by the time of Canton's next election in either May or August, Flodin said.



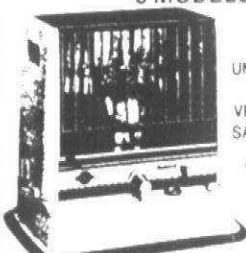

Brickley stumps for government reformation

Citizens' forfeit of their rights to special interests groups is one reason government may be unresponsive, maintains Lt. Gov. James Brickley.

The largeness of government coupled with citizen non-participation was the theme Brickley wove into an address calling for government reform.

The lieutenant governor spoke last week to the Rotary Club of Plymouth in the first in a series of planned re-

ports to the membership from governmental leaders from the national and state levels.

DISENCHANTMENT WITH government is increasing at the same time that citizens participation is declining, he said.

"And the public interest is taking a beating as single interest groups are flourishing. Today it is the lobbyists

who make the government and country tick.

"Seven to eight years after we knew we had an energy shortage we still don't have an energy policy, because the special interests can't agree upon one."

Besides the growing influence of lobbyists, Brickley pointed to another trend in government — voter attacks upon the presidency with congressmen escaping that wrath.

Of the past four presidents, Brickley said, not one has finished the two terms in office allowed by the U.S. Constitution. At the turn of the century, he added, about half of the congressmen were routinely defeated, but in the last election 95 percent of the incumbents were re-elected.

"That's because the president is a very visible office while what happens in the halls of congress is much less visible to the American people."

BRICKLEY ARGUED that government is too large in the sense that citizens are being asked to elect far too many people.

"There are more than 85,000 units of government in the United States and more than one-half million elected officials."

"Each citizen must vote for between 80-90 elected officials at various levels. No one can even name their 90 elected officials, let alone vote for them intelligently."

"That's too many. There are so many names on the ballot that we don't know who to hold responsible for what and we lose control."

"This is one of the reasons the highly visible people can't stay in office while those less visible are repeatedly being re-elected."

Brickley then traced some reasons for disenchantment with government and said that polls suggest most people

don't believe the political process is working for their behalf.

"What is the solution, then, for a government which isn't responding to its citizens and is having an impact on more and more of our resources?"

"IN LOOKING for a solution, one thing we should realize is that we can't change human nature but we can change the nature of institutions."

"And one important institution is our political parties. We have lost our respect for the role that can be, should be, and used to be played by the political parties."

"The role of a political party is to advance a program for the country, to link the candidate with that program, and to advance both to the citizens so that they have a choice."

"You can't judge the performance of 90 people, but you can judge the performance and philosophy of two par-

ties. We have forgotten that lesson. We have weakened the party system and in its place have put personality politics."

"With the help of the media, an individual candidate can back away from party and run with their own coalition. Then the party no longer is accountable."

"I would hope we can strengthen our political parties to develop coherent philosophies, making it possible for people to choose between two parties."

Brickley noted that computers cannot be counted on to make value judgments. "People, not computers, make value judgements. And the purpose of the political process, and the role of both parties, is to provide a way for people to make those value judgements."

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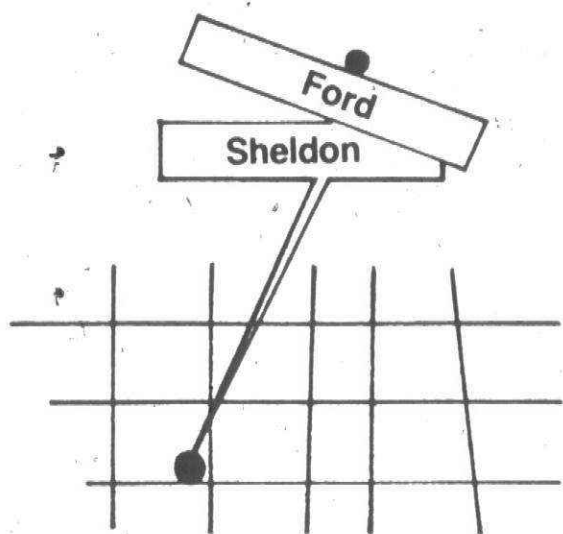

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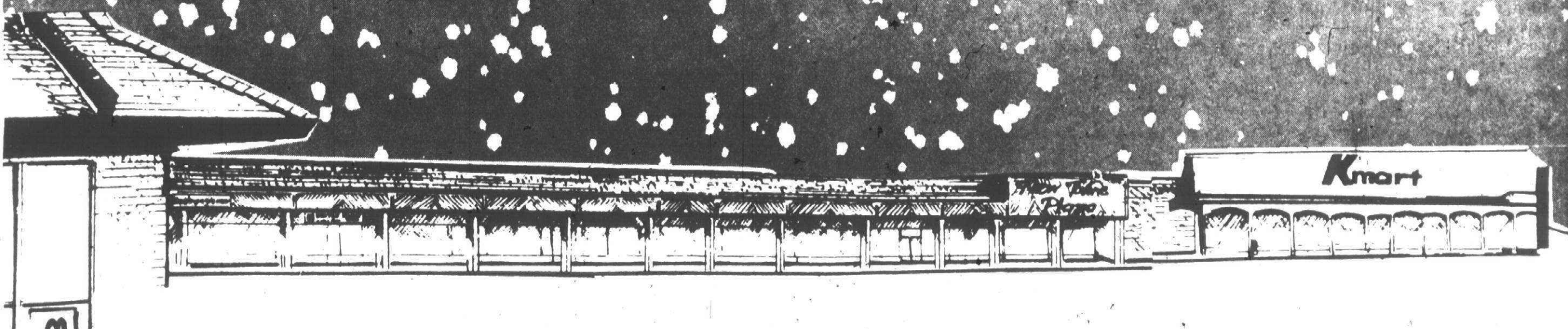


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Paris has choices, but Cannes has only one price

(Sam Hudson of Plymouth, local historian and author of "Plymouth Past and Present," is wintering in southern France. The column below is another in a series of how people can travel around Europe on a limited budget.)

I conversed recently with a Frenchman about the cost of living in France.

He is a professional musician (French horn) who once earned his living in Paris. Now retired, he lives on the outskirts of Cannes.

"How are prices in Paris," I asked him, "compared to prices in Cannes?"

"In Paris," he told me, "you have a choice. There are stores that cater to working people, as well as stores that cater to the rich. The prices vary accordingly. The same is true, to a lesser degree, in Nice.

"But in Cannes, there is only one price — for the rich."

A tiny demi-tasse of coffee in Cannes will cost you \$1.25; a small loaf of whole wheat bread, \$1.75. Beef, pork and veal sell for about \$5 a pound. Regular gasoline recently rose to more than \$3 a gallon.

An ordinary run-of-the-mill restaurant will charge you from \$8 to \$16 for lunch or dinner. A plate of spaghetti, alone, will cost you \$4.50.

The posh Carlton Hotel, on the waterfront, charges \$30 and up for lunch or dinner. Filet of sole, a la carte, is \$20. The New Year's Eve dinner dance at the Carlton, including caviar and a service charge, would have cost you \$158 per person. The food and service there may be superb, but we'll never know.

On the other hand, locally-grown vegetables and fruit at the markets

here are very reasonable in price. We have bought golden delicious apples, grown in Provence for about five cents each. And it is possible to obtain a good meal in a Supermarket, cafeteria in Cannes for less than \$4.00.

Hotel rates in Cannes at a one-star hotel run from \$12.50 per person to \$17.00 double occupancy. At the 4-star luxury hotels like the Carlton, you pay from \$58 to \$170 a night. Many of the hotels here, including the Carlton, will accept dogs anywhere in the hotel except in the dining room. It is not uncommon, however, to see dogs in restaurants in France.

Compared to apartment rates in Florida, California, Hawaii and other vacation spots in the United States, the rents for apartments in Cannes are not high. It is possible to rent an attractive apartment including a living room, bedroom bath, kitchen and balcony for

\$350 to \$400 a month completely furnished. And that includes utilities and the real estate agents monthly commission.

If you want to study French you can attend the local college for \$3 an hour. For private lessons you will pay \$22 an hour at a language institute, or \$10 an hour at an instructor's home.

Many French people who live in towns not far from the Italian border cross over to do some of their shopping. Following suit, we recently took a 1½ hour train ride from Cannes to Ventimiglia, Italy.

Three and a quarter miles from the French border town of Menton (where Winston Churchill used to paint), Ventimiglia is the first town on the Italian Riviera, going east.

Ventimiglia is an old Roman municipality with vestiges of an ancient Roman theatre. Friday is market day

in Ventimiglia and so many French people visit the place on that day that the market is often called "The French market."

I am told, however, that prices in Italy, as elsewhere in the world, continue to escalate, and that bargains are getting scarcer.

There is one item however that is still considerably cheaper in Ventimiglia than in France, and that is alcoholic beverages. A bottle of Ballantine Scotch that retails from \$10 to \$12 in Cannes can be purchased in Ventimiglia for \$6.30.

Cinzano Vermouth, which I have seen in Cannes \$7 can be had in Ventimiglia for \$2.30. Good Spanish sherry, like Dry Sack, also sells for half the price you pay for it in France.

You are allowed to take back into France three litres of wine and 1½ litres of whiskey per person. Many of the liquor stores that line streets near

the railroad station offer a special three-bottle price, comprising one bottle of scotch, one of Vermouth, and one of wine.

As you leave the railroad station in Ventimiglia on your way back to France the first person you meet before you board the train is a French customs officer. He not only checked the sack I was carrying, he also lifted Jessie's large purse to make sure we were not over the limit.

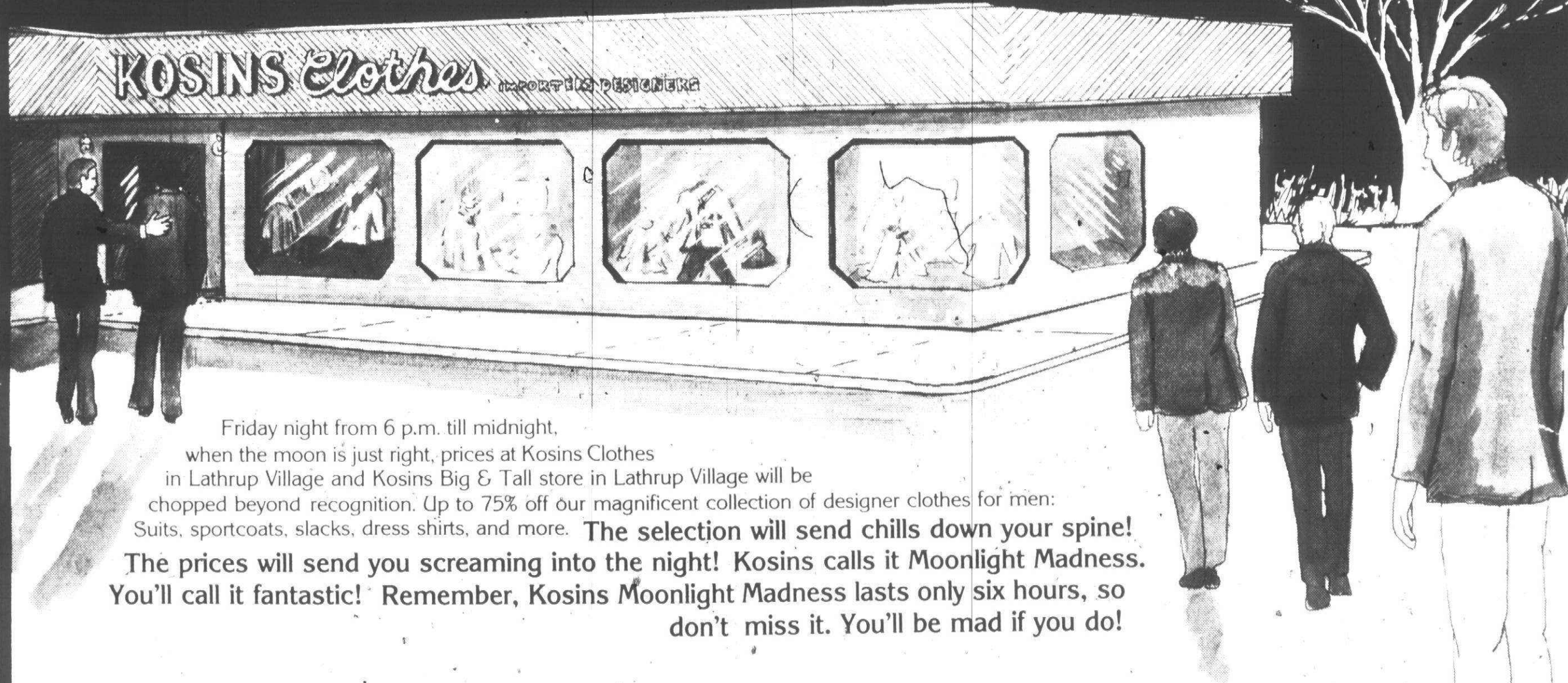
While we were in Ventimiglia, we were approached on three occasions by men who apparently attempt to con the many tourists who visit the place. One wanted to be our guide, another wanted some money in order to go by boat to Genoa, and the third wanted to know if I wanted to buy his Omega watch.

They all spoke to us in French, quickly changing to English when they heard the kind of French we speak. (To be continued)

Spend a little now to save a lot more later

Plymouth-Canton residents have, in the past, been penny-wise and pound-foolish.

School administrators and board members also had fallen into that trap.

But on Thursday, March 27, voters will have a chance to correct previous mistakes in a special election by approving Proposition III.

Proposition III is a request to approve the levy of an earmarked half-mill (50 cents per \$1,000 state equalized valuation) for 10 years to keep school buildings in a good state of repair.

A half-mill doesn't represent much in added taxes (\$15 a year more for the owner of a \$60,000 home) but it can go a long way in saving money in the future.

IN FACT, IF the half-mill had been levied for the past decade, the school district would not have to

ask for approval to borrow some \$11 million on March 27.

That loan is needed to pay for repairs and renovations of existing buildings which should have been taken care of years ago — things like new roofs, boilers, electrical and plumbing renovations, furniture replacement, etc. Because the bond issue will finance a "catch-up" maintenance program, the school district will end up paying \$800,000 to \$1 million a year in interest costs the first year. That cost could have been avoided if money had been spent each year for maintenance.

The \$11 million won't be seen on the ballot when residents go to the polls. The general maintenance cost is part of Proposition I which seeks voter approval of a loan for \$14.6 million. Part of Proposition I is for items to accommodate growth (such as \$550,000 for portable classrooms, \$500,000 for new

buses, and about \$1.5 million to expand year-round school at the elementary level.)

All of Proposition II and a portion of Proposition I are requests for money to find classroom space for incoming students. The "new growth" funds total about \$10.9 million.

Thus, about half of the money, if voters approve, will be used to pay for general maintenance which has to be performed with or without student growth.

BECAUSE MAINTENANCE has been put off in past years, residents will end up paying three times as much in taxes next year.

The cost in added taxes next year to pay for the \$11 million is about \$45 for the owner of a \$60,000 home — compared to the \$15 cost for the half-mill. That \$45 could have been saved if a half-mill for maintenance had been levied during the past 10 years.

The \$45 added cost will decrease each year as the \$11 million debt is retired. But the loan will be for a period of 29 years, compared to a 10-year period during which the earmarked half-mill will be levied.

During the past six years the school board did seek voter approval of earmarked millage for maintenance. Voters rejected that proposal, though.

In an effort to keep costs down, school boards in the past always have trimmed building maintenance items from operating budgets and spent money on books, buses, lunches, salaries, etc. Each year the money was "saved" the buildings deteriorated, and the costs of repairs have gone up.

Time is running out. The buildings must be repaired. And one thing we can be sure of — today's cost will be lower than tomorrow's.

But the district must do more than restore its buildings. The district must keep its buildings in good shape once they are restored. Voters should not have to be asked again to approve an \$11 million loan to get buildings into shape.

The half-mill will provide money which can be used only for maintenance and that fund, once established, can keep buildings in good shape from year to year.

The Observer urges a "yes" vote on Proposition III so taxpayers won't be given a bill again for catch-up maintenance. The Observer believes it's better to pay a little bit each year and avoid the higher costs of interest on loans and a repair bill which gets higher each year because of inflation.

Let's not be penny-wise and pound-foolish any longer. Let's vote yes on Proposition III on March 27.

We all own water system

Mayor Coleman Young has fired his opening gun in the battle over control of the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department.

It was a popgun.

When they get ready to take over Detroit Edison and Michigan Bell, then I'll be ready to turn over the water system — to the customers," he said.

What Young is saying is that Detroit owns the water-sewer system the way Edison and Bell stockholders own those companies.

Another's just plain factually wrong.

It's a common mistake. Many folks think that because Detroit's name is on the water-sewer system, there is some kind of capitalist-consumer relationship between Detroit and the 100 or so water-sewer customers.

DETROIT HAS virtually no general fund money invested in the water-sewer system. It never made the kind of capital investment in the system that Edison and Bell stockholders made when they purchased shares of the corporations.

This point was brought out clearly in the so-called "masters report" in the river pollution case in U.S. District Court.

So where is the capital investment coming from?

It's coming from revenue from the customers — Detroit and suburban. It's coming from state government to which we all contribute. It's coming from the federal government, to which we all contribute.

In sum, Detroit has no real moral claim to "ownership" of the water-sewer system. All it has is political control.

Now if suburban politicians were planning to take over Edison or Bell, they should be thinking in terms of buying out the stockholders' interests.

But in the case of the Detroit water-sewer system they are talking about regionalizing the management — coming up with a board where all communities have a voice, not just Detroit. That's elementary common sense.

YOUNG'S LACK of grasp of history was apparent when he said, "If it hadn't been for that water system, there wouldn't be any suburbs. Pontiac and all the rest of the surrounding area exist because of a water system which we freely offered to them."

He sounds like the cartoon character of the nagging mother who chronically complains that her children ignore her.

First, many so-called "suburbs" have histories of civilian English-speaking settlement that are as old as Detroit — Pontiac, Birmingham, Rochester, Farmington, Plymouth and so on.

Second, there was no "free offer" to become customers of the Detroit system. The fact is that, after post-World War II growth struck, the outlying communities began planning their own system. Someone suggested that instead of constructing a parallel system from scratch, the outlying communities make a deal with Detroit.

A deal was made — a deal between equals.

Young's attitude is that Detroit is the Mother Country and the outlying communities are Crown Colonies.

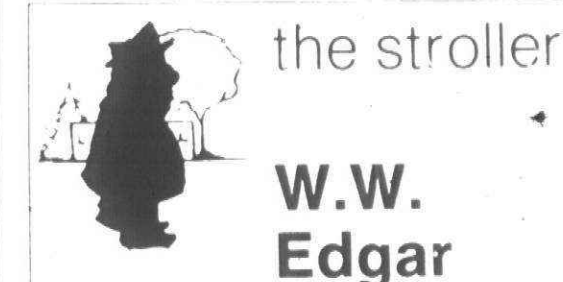
THE DETROIT sewage treatment plant is suffering not only from physical breakdowns that are polluting the Detroit River and Lake Erie. It is suffering from a political breakdown in which one community with one-third of the region's population exercises political control over a water-sewer system serving almost half the state.

The time has come to operate the regional water-sewer system with a regional governmental board.

The 'wonderful nonsense' days

Every time The Stroller picks up his favorite newspaper and sees pictures of high school boys engaged in the ancient Grecian sport of wrestling, he can't help wondering if we are heading toward another era of what was called wonderful nonsense.

These were the hilarious days back in the Romaning '20s and the Thrilling '30s when professional wrestlers held the center of the sports stage with some of the wildest scenes the major arenas ever saw.

What made these matches so memorable was that the contestants were both wrestlers and actors who had taken a page from P.T. Barnum's book and worked on the theory that there was a "sucker born every minute." For that reason, one never knew whether these bouts were really contests or pre-arranged exhibitions. But they put on quite a show.

IN THOSE DAYS the King of the group was Handsome Jim London, the champion of the heavyweights. When he appeared at Olympia, even standing room was at a premium.

London was an unusual athlete. Not only was he well built, but he had some peculiar beliefs. One was that he owed his success to clean living and drinking goat's milk. He had the special milk shipped to him on each visit.

He would sit by the hour arguing that his matches were on the level and that he would not do a dishonest thing.

But he wouldn't take a bet that he would pin his opponent sometime between 10:50 and 11 p.m.

The real shows were put on at a place called Arena Gardens on Woodward Avenue where Adam Weismuller, a former wrestler, held what he called a wrestling school.

There never was a school like it. He didn't teach wrestling. Instead, he and his partner, Eddie Lewis, taught the students how to express pain with facial gestures. They also taught various types of grooming that would help make the match appear honest.

ONE OF HIS prize pupils was Ali Baba, The Terrible Turk, who later was discovered to be a resident of Holyoke, Mass. He ended up being crowned the champion in a wild session at the Olympia.

He won the title when, after 50 hectic minutes, he lifted the defending champion Joe Stecher into the air and tossed him over the ropes. The referee didn't bother to count and later called it one of the best finishes he'd ever seen.

On another occasion, Weismuller came up with another drawing card who learned his lessons well. He was billed as "Farmer Pete" and came into the ring in coveralls holding a pig on a leash.

This was good for a laugh until John Hetteche, the late Northville sportsman who was the athletic commissioner, ruled both Pete and the pig out of the arena and had the admissions returned.

IN THE ERA before the wonderful nonsense, wrestling really was on the level.

Americans will count selves

April Fool's Day will be a very important day in the United States this year.

It's the effective date for the decennial census.

For most Americans, the 1980 census will be simple enough. A questionnaire will arrive in the mail on March 28. The recipient will simply answer the questions and then either mail back the form on April 1 or hold it for a census taker to pick up, depending on the instructions.

By the time the last American is counted sometime during the summer, the Bureau of the Census will have reached an estimated 222 million U.S. residents in 86 million housing units and gathered more than three billion answers.

Ninety percent of the nation's households will take their own census by answering the questionnaire and mailing it back. The remaining 10 percent will receive instructions to hold the completed form until a census taker picks it up.

Those in the latter group are mostly in sparsely populated areas, but in some cases they will be asked additional questions by the census taker.

If you don't mail back your form, a census taker will call on you.

CENSUS QUESTIONS seek basic information about people — age, sex, occupation and the like, and about subjects such as housing, personal transportation and energy use.

Most people will be asked to answer 19 basic questions. About one household in five, chosen randomly, will be asked to answer a longer version with 46 additional questions.

The primary purpose of the census is to provide a basis for reapportioning seats in the U.S. House of Representatives.

The census has been taken every 10 years since 1790.

Federal law requires everyone to answer the census. It also protects the confidentiality of personal information. The only persons who can see an individual's reply are census employees, who are sworn to secrecy under threat of a \$5,000 fine and a five-year prison term.

In the 50-year history of the modern confidentiality law, not once has the bureau or one of its employees been formally charged with releasing census information about any individual. Court cases have upheld the bureau's refusal to release the information to other federal agencies.

THE BUREAU of the Census will employ more than 250,000 temporary employees, all political appointees, who will collect 3.3 billion answers from 222 million U.S. residents spread over 3.6 million square miles.

It will use 65,000 cardboard desks for clerical workers because they are cheaper than renting furniture. They will also use 228,600 lead pencils, the equivalent of one pencil 345 miles long.

It will cost the taxpayers between \$4 and \$5 per person to take the 1980 census or a total of more than \$1 billion.

The final results, however, will be used as the basis for many federal programs, apportionment of the legislatures and useful information for private industry.

Fortunately, it only occurs every 10 years.

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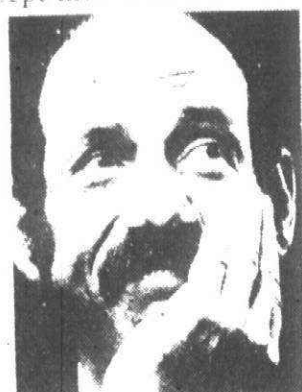

Bernardi, sporting a greying beard and wearing an army fatigue cap pulled down over his eyes, bore little resemblance to any publicity pictures I had seen, and since I was engrossed in my duties as the show's producer, I didn't even recognize the star as he strolled in my direction.

We had had a telephone conversation several days earlier when Bernardi had informed me of his increasing fatigue. It forced him to curtail all pre-publicity commitments except those which he could do in his hotel room.

Although Bernardi inherited a theatrical burthright from his parents who were stars of the Yiddish theater, he has found his greatest success within the last 20 years.

Having passed the half century of life several years ago, Bernardi has been pulled by an undertow of engagements.

His television role as Arnie, his Broadway roles in "Bajour," "Man of La Mancha" and "Fiddler on the Roof" all contributed to the tidal wave.

Things began to happen at Ford Auditorium the moment he picked up the rented cordless lavalier microphone.

Bernardi's rich, booming voice resounded but was hacked by an annoying sound like rushing wind. The

culprit attached to his tie refused to function correctly.

While I attempted to locate another mike, Bernardi lunged into rehearsal. Swiftly, he placed his array of props on the 8-foot table — a golden sword and silver helmet with pieces of wispy hair for mustache. Presto! Bernardi would become "Man of La Mancha."

Add ritual fringes and black cap, add a bit of makeup — Voila! Bernardi would be Tevye singing "If I Were a Rich Man."

Elliot Finkel, Bernardi's impressive piano accompanist, has unbelievable stamina. For two hours he remained at attention before the keyboard. A mild-mannered young man, Finkel is a concert pianist and entitled to his own share of applause.

REHEARSAL FOR Bernardi isn't a fast talk-through. Each story is told and every song sung exactly as in performance.

Most of Bernardi's attention during rehearsal is focused on the lighting.

"What is your name, please?" Bernardi called to the man in the light booth and repeated the question to the man off-stage at the light board.

The question is the key to Bernardi. He believes everyone has a name and he meticulously uses that name, personalizing all of his business dealings. Bernardi also wants people to use his first name.

Lights were of major importance to Bernardi for another reason.

Six weeks earlier he fell from the stage in Minneapolis when a light man missed a cue. Ignoring the mishap, he finished the show and made second curtain calls in the emergency room of a nearby hospital where he was treated for a broken elbow.

The Minneapolis performance had been the beginning of his tour for the Chabad-Lubavitch, a Jewish education organization. Bernardi performed the following weeks in tremendous pain.

WHEN BERNARDI learned it would be impossible to locate another cordless mike, he agreed to work with the lavalier mike which clipped on but involved a long, thin cord. He wanted to dance, but the cord ensnared his feet.

"Guess I'll just use it in the act," he decided. "I might as well joke about it since I'm going to have to carry it around all evening. I think I'll call it my 'shleppernish' (a Yiddish word meaning something one has to drag around)."

Having finished his finale, a weary Bernardi trudged to the Green Room where I had promised him a hot cup of Sanka.

"I don't understand what anyone is asking me or saying to me," Bernardi sighed as he sank into a

comfortable chair. "I'm so tired, everything sounds the same."

One hour later, 30 minutes before curtain time, a refreshed, relaxed Bernardi passed me on stage. "How's everything going?" he grinned.

"Great," I lied.

I wasn't about to disturb him with details, but while he was resting, Ford's crew had misplaced the turntable needed to play the recorded opening scene music. They found it only moments before Bernardi asked the leading question.

For a bonus, the lead guitar in our Israeli orchestra had blown an amplifier and I was nervously waiting for another from a local band leader and friend, Eric Rosenow.

The Hassidic Happening eventually did happen. For a surprise finale, Irving Laker, concert chairman, presented Bernardi an engraved plaque on behalf of Lubavitch, citing Bernardi for his contribution of happiness for all people.

He showed his appreciation by joining a group of black-coated, bearded rabbis dancing center stage, whirling about with amazing energy to the delight of the sold-out house.

Temperament? Theatrics? Those aren't for Herschel Bernardi. He's a celebrity who never forgot his roots.

Is it safe to pick up hitchhiker from Vermont?

A tall, nice-looking, well-dressed man was standing in Orchard Lake Road outside of the West Bloomfield library. He had a book under his left arm, and his right thumb was waving for a ride.

He did not appear to be a typical hitchhiker, and it seemed highly unlikely someone with harmful intentions would use this setting as a ploy. As I passed him, I felt the apprehensions drivers feel about picking up riders.

I quelled the guilt about my mistrust, rationalizing that by picking up any hitchhiker I could be exposing myself to potential danger.

I'll never know if his car was stuck in the library parking lot, if he had a hard time paying overdue book fines, or if he was a member of a mobile book club.

Of course, if I had picked him up, I would have found out. I learned as a youngster that a hitchhiker is subject to a driver's interrogation.

During those long trips to our summer house, picking up a rider was a pleasant diversion. My father had a weakness for anyone standing on the side

of the road holding up a sign that said "VERMONT."

I REMEMBER one young man in an army uniform who was going home on leave for the weekend to visit his girlfriend. All he wanted to do was go to sleep.

All my father wanted to do was to convince him to marry the girl back home. I think before he dozed off he said he would.

As a precocious pre-teen I was delighted that the guest was sitting next to me. I recall staring at his peaceful face, watching it as it was occasionally highlighted by passing headlights and thinking, "He may be going home to you, but look who he's sleeping next to now!"

When we pass hitchhikers on the road, our children ask us why we don't pick them up. We share with them the fears of our times, of being assaulted, robbed or kidnapped.

But I've also told them about the people Grandpa gave rides to when I was growing up, and they want to know why he wasn't afraid. It's difficult to explain that 25 years ago people trusted each other more and that just the magic of the word "Vermont" could make my father sure no harm would come to us.

LAST SUMMER, in Vermont, I wanted to share this type of experience with our children. My husband and I had discussed picking up a hitchhiker, and every time we saw a thumb out on the road, we

realized we were shopping for the right rider.

Early one evening on the way to a small town fair, we saw a young woman with a duffle bag jump out of a cab of a truck. As her ride drove off, she barely had enough time to put out her thumb when we picked her up.

During our interrogation, we found out that she was a college-bound student from Connecticut who was on her way to visit her brother. He was an actor in a summer stock theater group in the same town where we were headed.

I wonder now: If we were to pick up that same girl on Orchard Lake Road, would the word "Vermont" still assure our safety?

I would like to clarify a few things about the article. I feel some comments were misinterpreted. Contrary to what the title of the article may imply, I don't feel my child is a burden to us. Granted she may require a little more help, but we, my husband and I, do this willingly. We are trying to provide an environment to develop Lauren to her fullest human potential. In that fashion we are confident she will be some day independent and not be a burden to anyone, including the public.

Secondly, the mothers' sessions are not held just to gripe about our situations. Although sometimes that is what

we do, but what mother, even of all "normal" children, does not gripe now and then. These sessions are held to provide the parents with an opportunity to talk about their situations with other parents and professionals. We are helping each other. In most instances, the information we receive applies to all children.

Thirdly, it is very important for the public to know that there is help available through the school district. In particular, for young children such as ours, IPSEP (Infant-Preschool Special Education Program) is available in the Plymouth-Canton school district. They provide the personnel to teach the children as well as educating us, the parents. Anyone having questions about a child with special needs is urged to contact IPSEP at Farrand School (420-0363). Believe me, it has helped us a great deal.

 Team wins district

Rock grapplers seize district crown

Plymouth Salem's wrestlers can add the Class A District trophy to their already crowded case.

The Rocks recorded 12 pins and qualified nine grapplers for Saturday's regional tournament at Westland John Glenn. Salem scored 76 points to beat its closest competitor, rival Belleville of the Suburban Eight League. Coach Ron Krueger's squad, winner of seven tournaments, unbeaten in dual meets and Suburban Eight League champs, dominated the 19-team field last Saturday at Ann Arbor Huron.

"We did a real good job," said Krueger. "This was our finest day of the year. We came in rested and

ready." The top four wrestlers in each weight class qualified for the Glenn regional. Jim Schultz, raising his victory total to 43 this season, went unbeaten in two matches to qualify for the Rocks in the 108-pound weight division.

Other Salem wrestlers who qualified and went undefeated included Jeff Dunson (115), Jeff Brown (122), Mark Ross (129), Jerry Valchine (1), Steve Szilagyi (170), Jeff Powers (188), Stan Snider (201) and Greg Gattoni (heavyweight). Both Valchine and Powers recorded two pins on the day. Valchine, a senior, now has 45 wins this year. Tom Harrel (115) was the only wrestler from Plymouth Canton to qualify for the tournament.

HE IS NOW 31-13-1 on the year and has won 16 of his last 19 matches. He pinned both in the Huron district as he took over the team-point lead.

"Tom has an excellent shot," said Canton Coach Dan Chrenko. "He's doing very well right now. He's been really strong."

Canton's Dave Vaughan (170) and Steve Hamblin (148), both considered to have a good chance of qualifying, failed to make the necessary weight for the tournament and did not compete.

Salem freshman Jeff Wojcik, was eliminated from the tourney in the 101-pound division, but ended the season with 22 victories, a school record.

Bruce Bachman (135) of Salem lost a

tough 4-3 decision to his opponent from Walled Lake Central. Bachman had missed the league meet two weeks ago due to illness. Bob Price (148) also came up short as he lost to Northville's Steve Morgan by way of a pin. The Salem wrestler took third in the Suburban Eight League meet.

Although sending nine wrestlers to Glenn, Krueger was disappointed with the seeding given to Scott Piper (158), who was eliminated by Ann Arbor Pioneer's Darryl Minick in a close match, 3-2.

"As happy as I felt about the day I was disappointed about the seeding in Scott's division," said Krueger. "I thought he got the shaft."

SALEM, Belleville and Temperance-Bedford, winner its own district, appear to be the three favorites at Glenn. Krueger emphasized that the Suburban Eight League could once again figure strongly in the race for the Regional crown.

"Trenton was second down at Temperance-Bedford and (Dearborn) Edsel Ford wasn't far behind," he said. "That shows the strength of our league with Belleville also placing second in our district."

Once again, the top four wrestlers in each weight category advance to the Class A finals Saturday, March 1 at Lansing Eastern.

Hook at buzzer sinks Redford Union

Monk's desperation shot gives Salem 55-54 win

The next time the Harlem Globetrotters come to town they ought to look up Plymouth Salem center Howard Monk.

The 6-6 senior took a page out of Meadowlark Lemon's cage book by sinking a desperation 30-foot fadeaway half hook at the buzzer to stun Redford Union Tuesday night, 55-54.

Monk, who led all scorers with 22 points, was only steps from the sideline when he received a pass from teammate Mike McBride.

RU had grabbed the lead with only five seconds left when reserve forward Tom Jetke hit a jumper near the free throw line.

Salem immediately called a time out underneath the Panthers' basket. The Rocks then took the floor again, but

signaled for another timeout.

"We wanted to see what type of thing they (RU) would set up against us," explained Salem Coach Fred Thomann, whose team upped their record to 15-2 overall.

RU Coach Bill Foley elected to have his squad set up a pressing defense in Salem's backcourt.

The ball was inbounded to guard Mike Sharp who passed laterally to Mike McBride along the backcourt sideline. The Salem forward took two dribbles and flung the ball to Monk for the winning shot.

"Tell me how it went in," said a shocked Thomann in the dressing room after the game. "It was good recognition by McBride."

FOR RU, now 8-10 overall, it was a heartbreaking setback.

"The kids played a whale of a game," said Foley. "It took a break to beat us. It was a sensational lucky shot."

"We had a great team effort. No one is to blame."

Foley, who's been coaching for almost 30 years, argued vehemently with the officials after the winning shot.

"I thought maybe they (Salem) took more than five seconds getting the ball in," he explained. "I can't complain about the refs. It's their judgment." Foley, who coached Detroit Catholic Central to some fine records in the 1960s, said "I don't recall being beat like that ever."

"Those things happen. We had everybody covered on the play. It was just a fluke thing."

Center Glenn Roberts paced the Panthers with 16 points.

Guard Todd Hillis added 15. But it was Jetke, replacing Jerry Burk who fouled out midway through the fourth quarter, that almost became the hero.

His steal and pass underneath to teammate Hillis for a layup gave RU its first lead since early in the third quarter, 50-49, with 2:54 remaining.

MONK ANSWERED with a short jumper in the key just 30 seconds later to give the Rocks a 51-50 edge.

Guard Rocco Rucinski, who tallied nine points, scored with 2:04 left to put

Area spikers falter at Howell

Tournament action for both the Plymouth Salem and Canton volleyball teams has been cumbersome this season with four tournaments listed on this year's schedule.

However, with as much tournament experience the two teams have had this year, both schools failed to qualify for the quarterfinal action in the Howell Volleyball Invitational Saturday at Howell Jr. High School.

Of the two area teams, the Salem squad managed to come home with the better of the two records after defeating Hartland but dropping matches to Ypsilanti and Livonia Bentley.

Canton split its match with Waterford Kettering then lost straight matches to Grand Blanc and Howell to end the day with a 1-5 record.

Put at a disadvantage before walking on the court because of the absence of No. 1 setter Sandy Faussett, out with the flu, and an injury to Dana Harter, Salem managed to pull itself together

to give its opponents a battle.

"Against Ypsilanti, no one on the court was moving," said Salem Coach Cathy Himes. "We played a 5-1 offense with the team's third setter who hasn't seen much playing time."

Salem's third setter, Jacque Merrifield, made attempts at setting up the Salem attacking line but was weakened by the poor serve reception of the Rocks' defense.

"Our serve reception was poor so the ball rarely got up to the setter," said Himes. "Overall, we had a weak defense and offense against a team that was out to kill since they (Ypsilanti) had already lost one game and needed to win to secure first place in our pool."

Salem bounced back against Ypsilanti (9-15, 11-15) by downing Hartland using a 4-2 offense, 15-6, 15-9.

"Dana did a good job considering but I have to commend Debbie Hartford for her setting against Hartland," continued the Salem coach. "This was the

first time Debbie has set for us in a game and the first time the team has played a full 4-2 offense during an entire match. They adjusted real well."

Against Bentley, a Suburban Eight League opponent of the Rocks, Salem depended on aggression during the second game of the contest after losing the first, 15-1.

"We played a better defense when I went back to the 4-2 after switching back to a 5-1," said Himes. "They (Salem) picked up a lot of balls but weren't playing a strong mental game."

Besides Hartford and Harter, Himes complemented the play of juniors Cheryl Sobkow and Mary VanDusen for aggressive work on defense at the net.

Canton coach Cyndi Burnstein said that a lack of a strong defense on serve reception has been plaguing her squad all season and Saturday was no different.

"Poor serve reception and poor communication on the court was what has

gotten us all year," said Burnstein. "Our defense was also weak and Howell was able to penetrate right into the open areas of the court."

Canton's scores against Kettering were 15-6, 9-15 followed by a loss to Grand Blanc 15-10, 15-9. Howell overpowered the Chiefs to a 15-7, 15-8 match.

Following tournament action, the Canton squad resumed regular season play Monday by taking on non-league opponent Dearborn on the road.

THE PIONEERS downed the Chiefs 15-4, 15-1 in the two game contest.

"We were nailed on serve reception," said Burnstein. "When we did get the ball into the air, we looked good — better than Dearborn — but getting the ball up to the setters was the big problem."

The Canton loss dropped the squad's season record to 6-3 with a 6-2 mark in the Western Six league.

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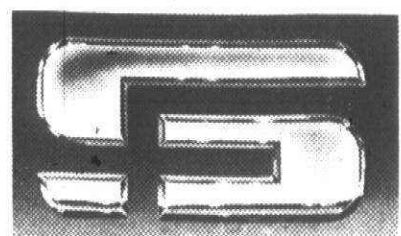
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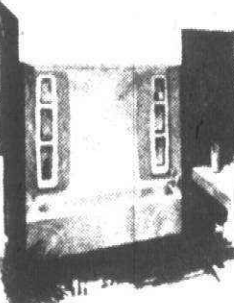
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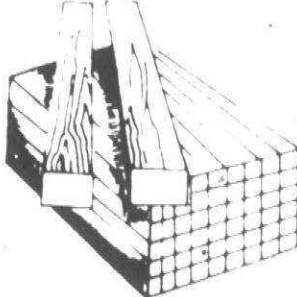
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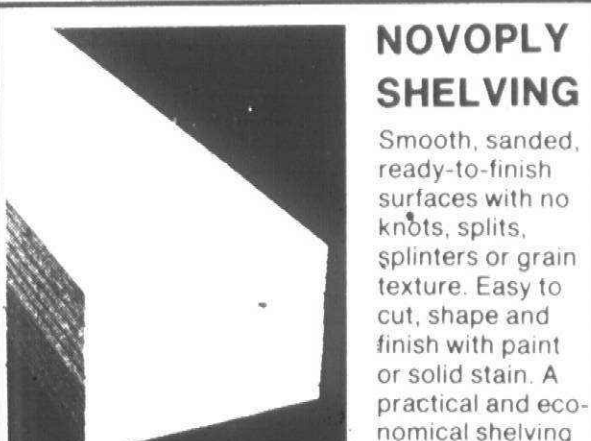
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The stage is all set for the first major tournament of the year in the metropolitan area.

Salem, a member of the tough Suburban Eight League, relies on team balance led by senior co-captain Kirk Albert and sophomore Russ Shaffer.

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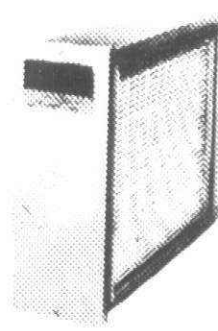
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Chief gymnasts break mark again

"Katy had a well balanced performance," Cunningham said. "She had four good events tonight."

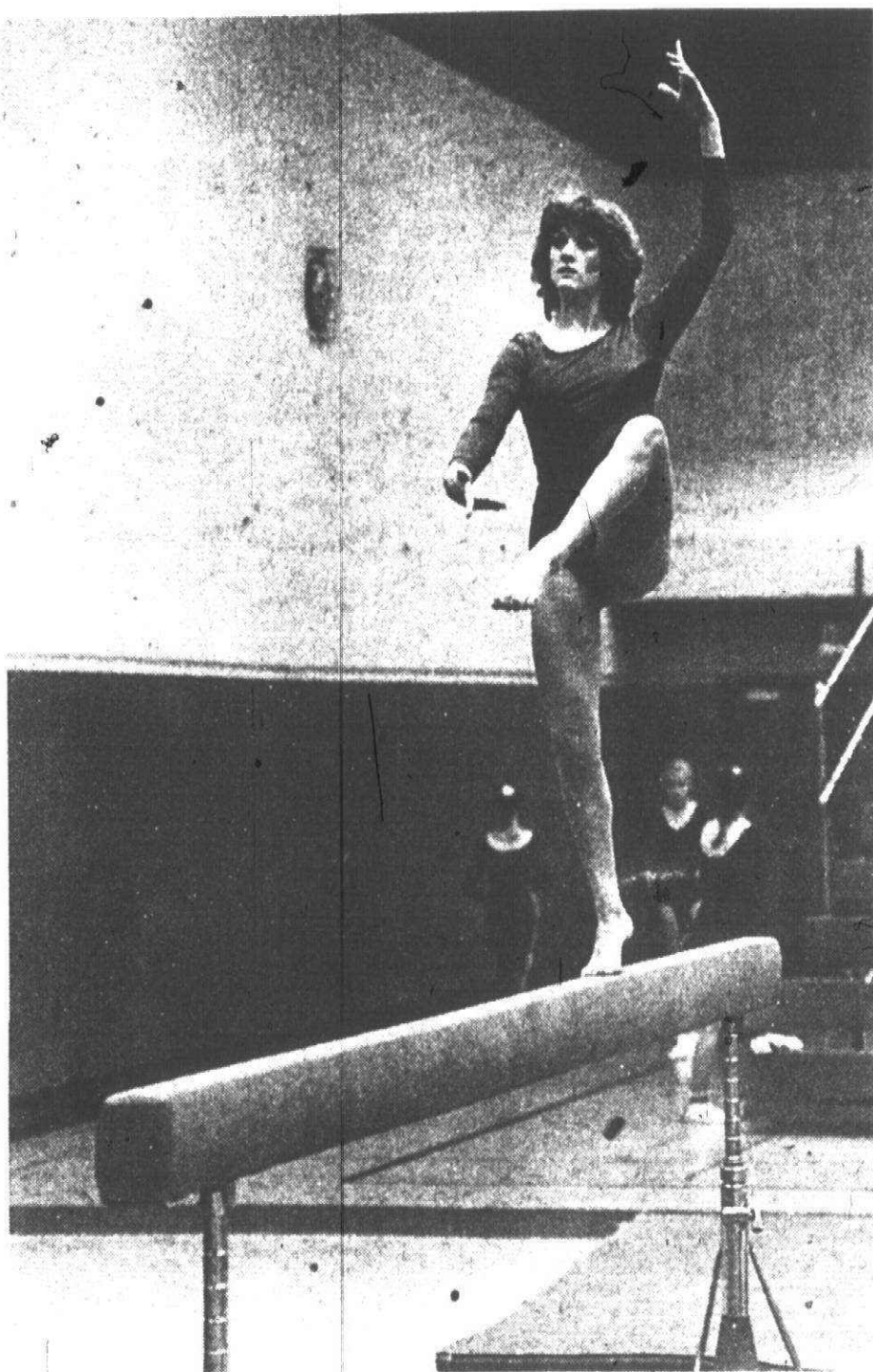
Heaton was second in both the uneven parallel bars (6.85) and balance beam (7.5). She also took third in both the vault (8.15) and floor exercise (7.75).

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

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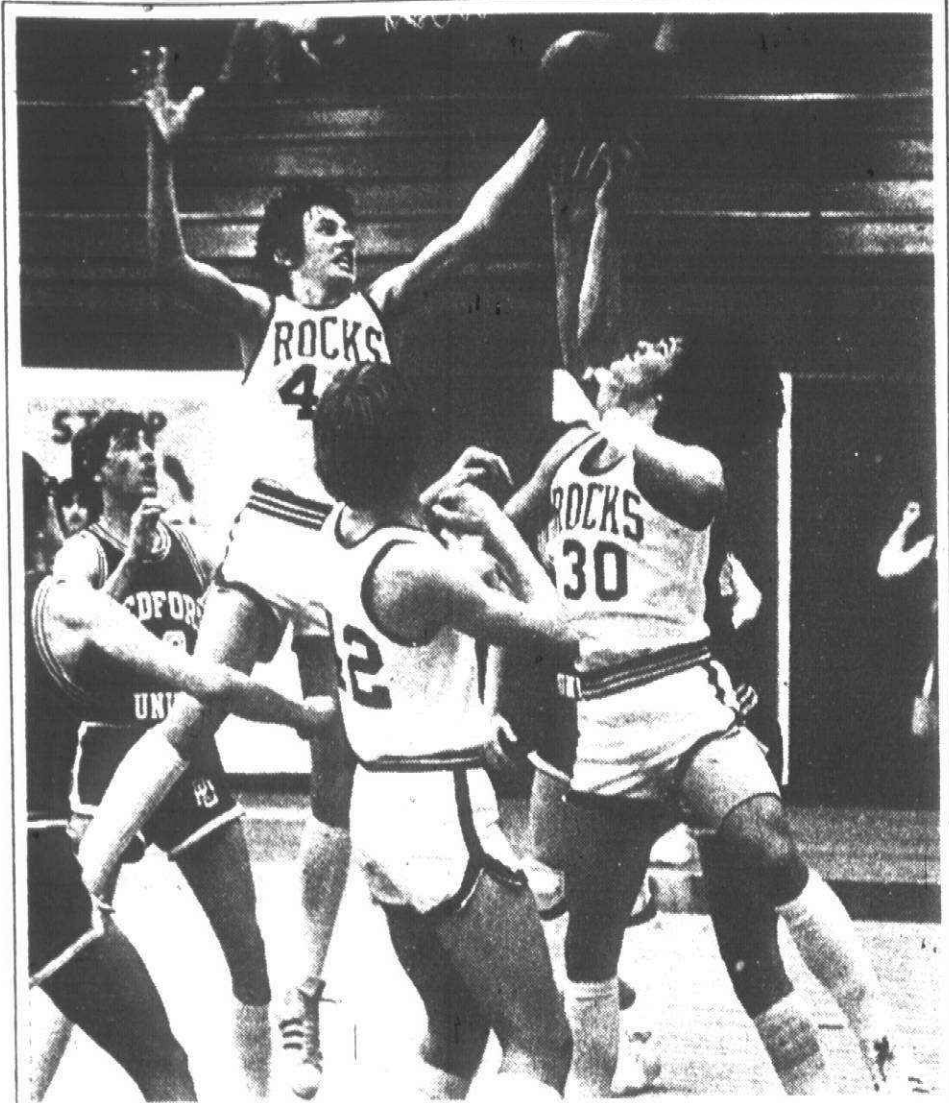

The Bulldogs trailed all the way Tuesday. Dearborn took a 27-18 half-time lead, as Bentley couldn't get untracked in the early going.

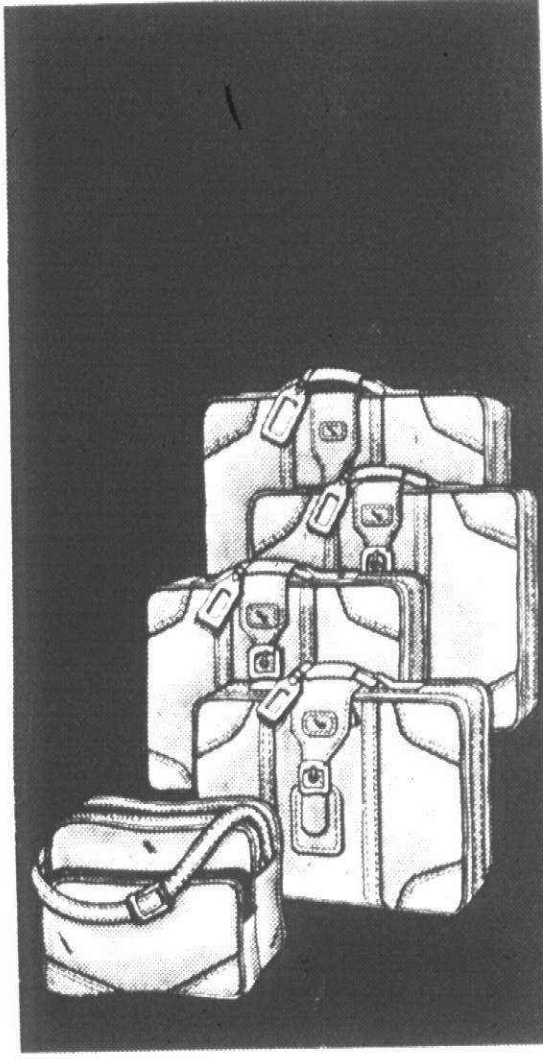
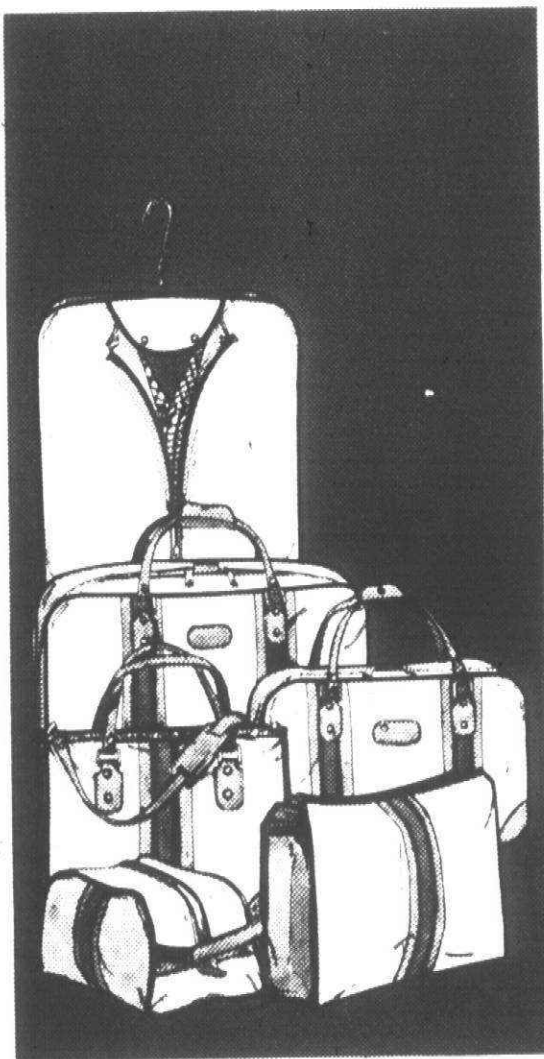

TAG keeping step with national trend

Does gifted mean handicapped?

In a sense, it does. In an egalitarian society, being academically gifted makes one "different," and being "different" is often regarded with suspicion.

The term "exceptional" children is often used to designate both the academically gifted and handicapped.

In the Plymouth-Canton area, report educators and parents, parents have refused to have their children enrolled in classes for the talented and gifted because it would label them as being "different."

A Plymouth mother whose child recently started to attend a private school for the academically gifted is reluctant to tell her friends and neighbors.

The gifted student can be a problem to teachers, to parents and to himself.

"I think they saw him as a lot of extra trouble," said the mother of one gifted Plymouth kindergarten student.

"One of my son's nursery school teachers told me that raising a gifted child was as difficult in many respects, and as challenging as raising a handicapped child," said another mother.

"I know I'm different," said one 5-year-old. "For one thing, I read more than anyone else in my family." He was relieved when he was told that it was all right to be different.

HIS REACTION reflects a change in attitude towards gifted students that is becoming nationwide.

According to a New York Times article late last year, parent groups across the country are making themselves heard. They are demanding the "special" education their children need.

Here, a parent group, the Plymouth Canton Association for the Academically Talented (PCAAT), has been in existence for five years, and Plymouth Canton Community Schools have had a Talented and Gifted program for three years. Louise Townley is president of the PCAAT.

Disappearing is the idea that smart children don't need direction; that they can learn on their own. After all, people would say, Albert Einstein and Winston Churchill had trouble in school, but they survived.

Today, educators and parents are wondering how many Einsteins and Churchills are lost, because they were not given direction and challenges.

Educators agree that about 25 percent of all high school dropouts are "academically talented." One recent speaker in Plymouth, Roger Taylor, put the figure as high as 50 percent.

Plymouth-Canton's TAG program is a beginning effort to stop this waste. By contrast, Livonia has had a program for gifted children for 10 years; Ann Arbor still has none.

THE STATE of Michigan, which was ahead of the federal government in mandating "mainstreaming" of academically handicapped children in the 1970s, is "25 years behind the times" in mandating education of gifted children, according to Rick Olenchak, coordinator of the program.

Said Olenchak: "We recently had a student move here who had been in a TAG program in Pennsylvania. Included in her school records was a 35-page outline of the type of instruction this child ought to be getting."

With a state budget of \$500,000 for education of the gifted and talented, Michigan can produce nothing like this at the present time. Pennsylvania mandated expenditures of \$18 million for education of gifted and talented children in 1978-79, according to figures Mrs. Townley has received from the Office of the Gifted and Talented in Washington, D.C. Similarly California, Tennessee, Florida, Illinois and North Carolina have budgets in the millions for education of these children.

The Plymouth-Canton yearly budget has been between \$45,000 and \$60,000.

With it, Olenchak and his assistant, Marilyn Finch, have been able to spend about an hour each week in special programs in each of the area's 14 elementary schools. They have been assisted by volunteers, usually interested mothers, involve more senior citizens in the elementary school program, but has found that transportation is a problem.

The area's four middle schools have given varying attention to setting up special programs for TAG students. Pioneer's program is cited by several parents as being the best. Some two to four hours a day are "eked" out for TAG students to meet.

In the high school, there are more opportunities for talented and gifted children to stretch their minds, according to John Hoben, superintendent of schools. A variety of electives and advanced placement courses are offered. Further programs are being studied.

A third TAG specialist is being hired shortly.

BOTH HOBEN and Olenchak agree that the next step in the program must be a concentration on training teachers. In a classroom of 30 children, it is not always easy to spot a talented or gifted child. And once he/she is identified, they need special attention.

Furthermore, Michigan universities are behind in this field, said Olenchak. Michigan teachers are not required to take any courses in the teaching of the talented and gifted before they graduate. Wayne State University is just now instituting a program.

Spotting these students is sometimes difficult because, according to educators, "In elementary school, they cop out; in high school, they drop out."

The student learns that if he is able to finish 50 problems in mathematics in a quarter of the time it takes the rest of the class, he will likely be given 50 more to do. The second 50 will be just as boring, and the rest of the class will think he's "weird."

He learns quickly to go along with the crowd; to slow down and to keep his opinions to himself. If he doesn't, he's often labeled a troublemaker by parents and teachers.

What is the solution? To many educators and parents, a private school for bright children alone is not the answer. "They have to learn to get along in

the real world," said Olenchak. Mrs. Townley agrees: "You have to learn to handle teachers who think you are odd, and you have to learn to handle children sitting next to you who don't have the slightest idea of what you are talking about."

Besides this, private schools are expensive, and transportation is costly and time-consuming. "There's no time left over for soccer," commented Mrs. Townley.

"At the same time," she continued, "we would like our children to be educated to their fullest potential."

Olenchak would like to see some of the ideas of mainstreaming — in which handicapped children and slow learners are incorporated in regular classrooms as much as possible, but also have their own classrooms — carried out. "They need time, every day, when they can be together and challenge each other," he said.

UNDER THE present system, both teachers and parents are asked to recommend students for TAG programs. Placement is made on the basis of group intelligence tests, group achievement tests, individual intelligence tests, proven demonstrated ability and past placement in a TAG program.

The idea of giftedness has changed in recent years. Formerly the gifted were only those who scored well on intelligence tests. A TAG brochure, issued by the schools, identifies them as those "who have the potential to perform at higher levels than average."

filled his patch in with the words (in red) "Big Red," to commemorate his red hair.

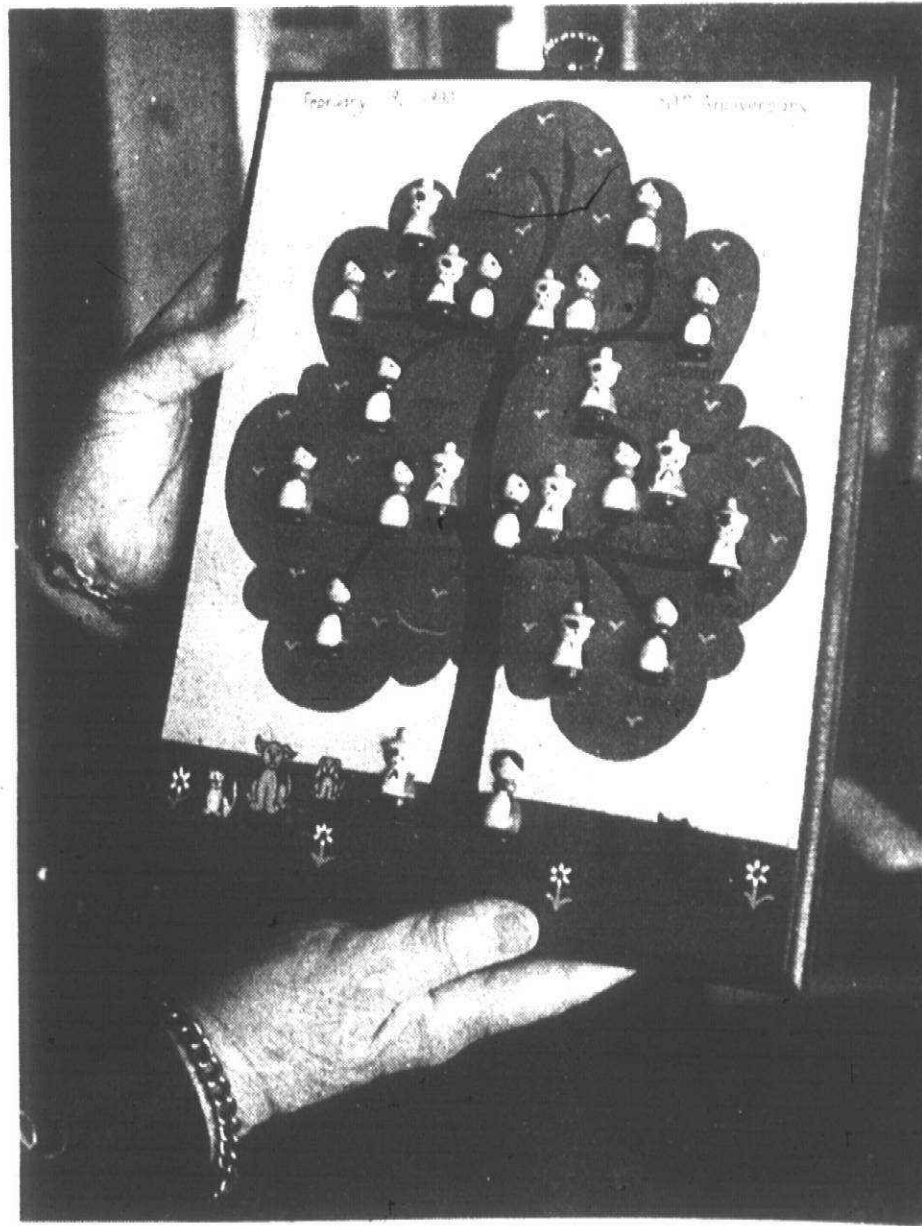

This includes children with "demonstrated or potential abilities in general intellectual ability, a specific academic area, creative/productive thinking, leadership ability, visual or performing arts and psychomotor ability."

Olenchak, Hoben and Mrs. Townley are optimistic about the future of gifted and talented children in Plymouth and Canton and in the state.

Olenchak believes that the solution for TAG children is individualized, personalized instruction, such as that outlined for the student from Pennsylvania.

This, he believes, will be the trend of the 1980s, not just for the gifted and the handicapped, but for all children.

"We believe the TAG program will do something to expand the horizons of all educational programming," he said.

What is needed, besides state funds, believe Olenchak and Mrs. is greater awareness.

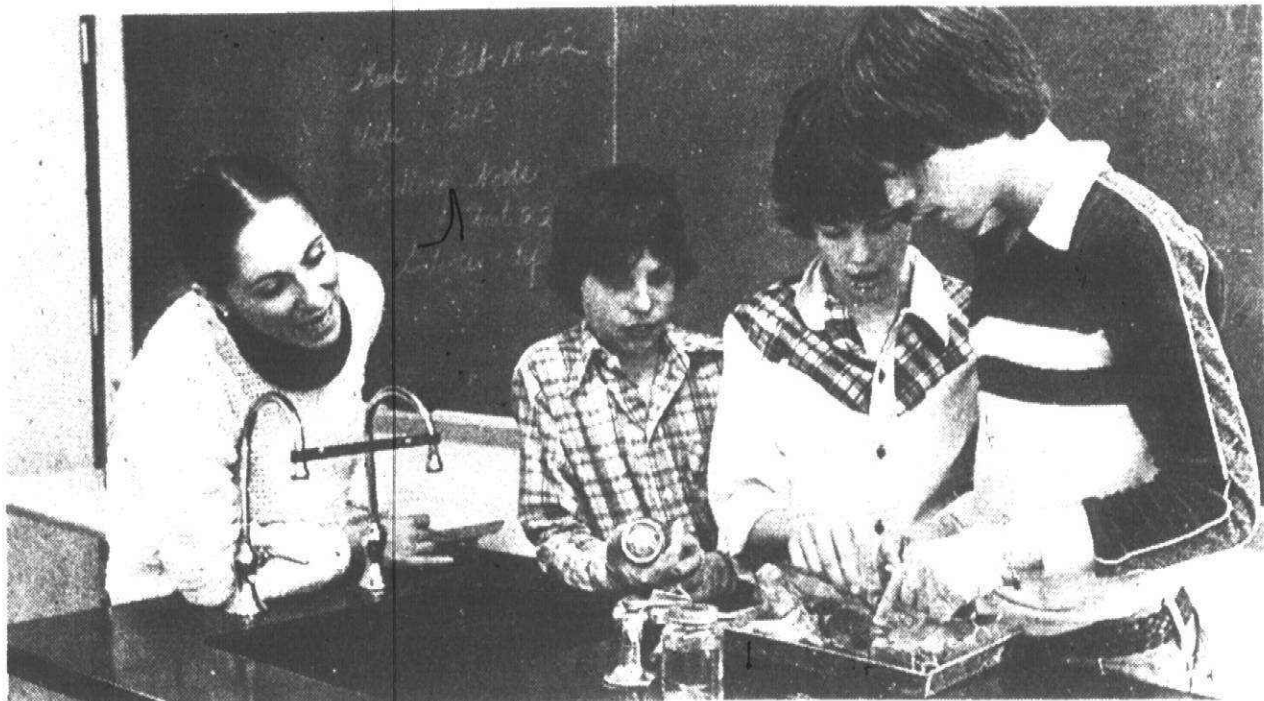
"Parents need to overcome their reluctance, at times, to admit they have a child who is different," said Mrs. Townley.

"If I had a gifted child," said Olenchak, "I would give him as much responsibility as he can handle, and I would, when an interest is expressed, go to the ends of the earth to quench it."

They agree that teachers need to be made more aware of the special needs of the gifted child. They need to know such things as that gifted children are often supersensitive; they need to know that just giving them more work to do is not enough, that these children must be given direction so they can deal with a subject more deeply and more creatively.

Being different is not easy.

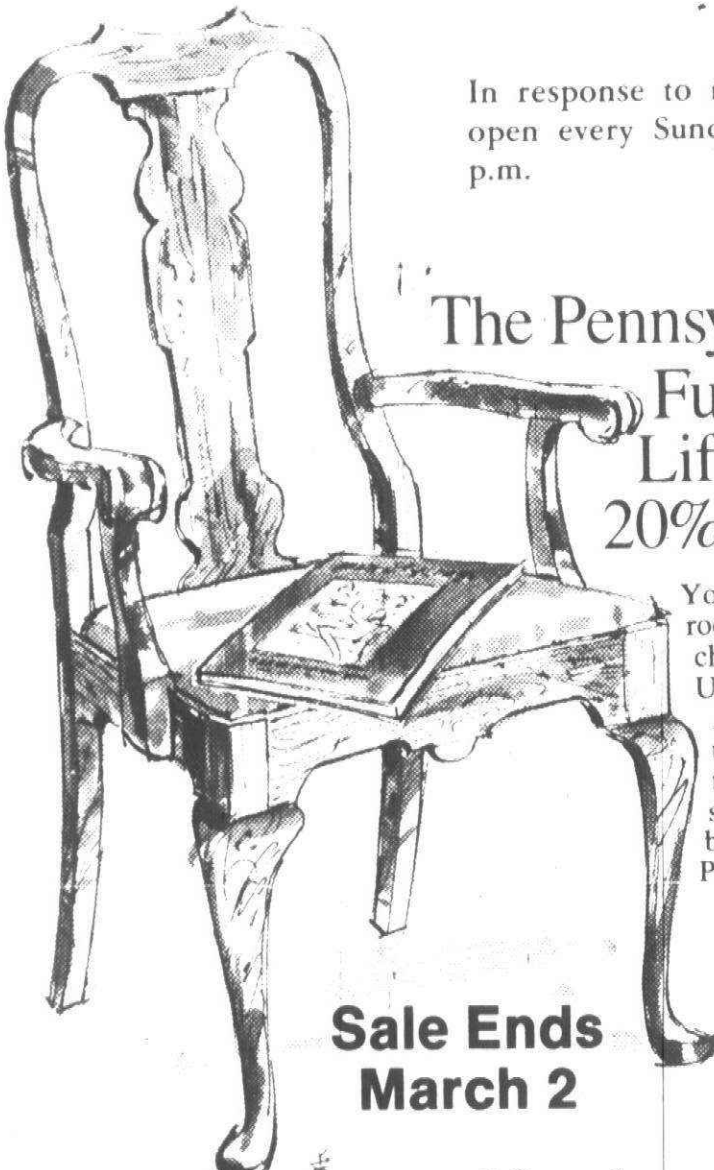

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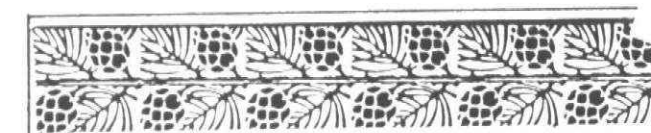

Modern missionaries

They're helping feed Cambodians, shoe Afghanistan refugees

By MARGARET MILLER

Intravenous feeding solutions for Cambodia and blankets, shoes and vaccines for Afghanistan are among the top priority items these days for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR).

That was the report of Gerald Schmidt, UMCOR assistant general secretary, who visited this area as one of the speakers for a Mission Saturation event that involved six United Methodist Churches.

The representative of one of the world's largest church-affiliated relief organizations addressed senior citizens at Newburg UMC.

He said UMCOR food supplies are getting into Cambodia, "despite the reports you may read."

"One of the main things our staff people have asked for is a supply of IV solutions, because they found that people who had been on the edge of starvation could not immediately assimilate solid food."

Although the Cambodian population has been decimated, there are signs of improvement, Schmidt said.

"Today we are seeing hardly any cases of outright starvation," he said. "We are working now on severe malnutrition. Next we will be bringing in seeds for planting and offering help in agriculture."

IN AFGHANISTAN, Schmidt said, UMCOR has undertaken to help some 700,000 refugees who headed through

the Khyber pass to escape into Pakistan.

"It's winter, and they don't have shoes," he said. "We felt we must do something, and we called to see what was needed most."

"Blankets, vaccines and shoes, we were told. These are being shipped in for these amazingly hardy people."

Schmidt said UMCOR workers cooperate with the Red Cross and the United Nations in the various areas where all serve.

"We agree not to overlap and get in each other's way," he said. "The difference is that we work from the bottom by cooperating with the churches. The U.N. will provide the tents and the food in Cambodia, for instance, but the IV solutions are what we bring in."

SCHMIDT ALSO told the seniors how bulldozer operators and band uniforms had symbolized UMCOR operations in recent years.

The bulldozer operators, he said, were procured after Hurricane Fifi had leveled large areas of Honduras several years ago. The band uniforms pro-

duced a chain reaction for several mountain villages, he added.

Representatives of UMCOR, Schmidt said, reached Honduras 48 hours after Fifi struck.

"Debris had washed over the beaches and was piled so high many homes were inaccessible," he said.

"We work with the churches, going to them and asking what we can do that will be most helpful. In this case we were told that clearing the debris was the most necessary thing to be done, and that a couple of bulldozers were available."

"But they needed operators, and the operators had to be able to speak Spanish," Schmidt said.

UMCOR HAD the means to help, he said.

"We have a name bank in our New York office," he explained. "It lists people who have special skills and have indicated a willingness to serve for special short term projects."

"That bank came up with the names of two Spanish-speaking bulldozer op-

erators. One of them had been listed for six years, one for five."

They were dispatched to Honduras, and the debris-clearing was accomplished.

"So if anyone tells me that church people are willing to send money but not to give of themselves, I can tell them differently."

After that particular disaster, Schmidt said, UMCOR used rotating personnel to keep a medical team operating for more than two years.

"Doctors and nurses would stay a month or so and then would go back and be replaced by others," he said.

THE BAND UNIFORMS came to the fore when UMCOR started trying to find ways to help those in the Indian villages in the mountains, said Schmidt.

"They are illiterate and have no schools or sanitary facilities," he said, "and we wanted to find a way to improve the quality of their lives. But we knew it wouldn't do any good just to send money. When the funded project was over conditions would just revert to what they had been."

Instead, he said, the agency decided to take a couple of young people from each of the villages and train them in communications development, then send them back to the villages to try to learn what sort of help seemed most important.

"We waited and waited after they went back," Schmidt said, "and finally we heard from one of the villages. They

had established a village council and had considered what were their top priorities."

"And we couldn't believe it when they told us that at the top of the list they had put band uniforms."

"Our first reaction was to say the request was utterly stupid, but then we decided to help them," he said.

THE MISSION workers first showed the villagers how to take the wool of a mountain goat that flourished in that area and spin and weave it into cloth.

"Then they got sewing machines, and learned to make dyes," Schmidt said.

"After a year they had the nicest band uniforms on that mountain."

"They also had something else. They had several small industries going, and they had a new sense of self-respect that led them to realize their town needed other improvements, better schools, better sewers and so on."

But that was not the end of the band uniform story, according to Schmidt.

"The next village over noticed the improvements and decided to begin its own, and then other settlements in the area did the same," he said.

"And the thing has been spreading ever since, through the mountains of Honduras and now Nicaragua."

Resident gets jail term and fine for bribery

A Plymouth Township man has been sentenced to nine months in jail and fined \$50,000 by a U.S. District Court judge after pleading guilty to bribing teamster official Richard Fitzsimmons.

Norman Klein, 43, was indicted on charges of bribing Fitzsimmons to handle grievances and ensure labor peace while a vice president for FCS Indus-

tries Inc. The company is an auto parts hauling firm with branches in Michigan and Illinois.

Klein, his partner Richard Wolfe of Illinois and Fitzsimmons were sentenced last week by Judge Avern Cohn.

A grand jury had filed its indictments against the three men last August and in December Klein and Wolfe pleaded guilty to five of 39 bribery

counts. They then were released on \$1,000 personal bonds and had been awaiting sentencing ever since.

Fitzsimmons, son of Teamsters International President Frank Fitzsimmons, was sentenced last Friday to 2½ years in prison and fined \$10,000 by Judge Cohen. He had been charged with "unlawfully accepting payments to a labor official" totaling about \$100,000 from the Kubach Trucking Co.

of Dearborn. He pleaded guilty in December to two of the 88 bribery counts established by the grand jury.

Fitzsimmons, who also was directed to relinquish his union activities, was accused of demanding the payments from the two trucking officials while he was vice president and recording secretary of Local 299.

The Kubach trucking firm had con-

tracted drivers to Klein's company which has a Detroit office. According to one FCS employee, this firm regularly contracted up to 30 drivers from Kubach to haul auto parts for Chrysler Corp.

It's been charged Klein and Wolfe made five payments of \$700 each to Fitzsimmons after receiving the money from Kubach. No Kubach officials

were named by the grand jury. It's also been reported the payments were made through ICS's consulting firms of J&R Consulting Service and C&S Consulting Service.

Klein and Wolfe both received the maximum fine of \$50,000 as covered by law, however, their nine-month prison sentencing fell short of the five-year term as allowed by law. Fitzsimmons had faced a maximum \$35,000 fine.

Consulting firm gets government contract

Odiorne Associates of Plymouth has been awarded a contract to develop and conduct a training workshop in career counseling with the International Communication Agency in Washington, D.C.

"The participants will be career counselors, geographically-based area personnel officers, and personnel policy-makers and administrators."

The workshop will be conducted March 4-7 at the ICA Conference Center in Washington, D.C.

The conference will address such themes as theory and practice of career development, the state of the art, counseling skills, affirmative action and upward mobility, the use of skills and values identification in developing an individual career development plan.

DeRoche's experience in career counseling includes three years of individual counseling as well as conducting group workshops in career/life planning.

While at Haldane Associates DeRoche conducted in-service training programs for the Great Lakes area counseling staff. He currently is

chairperson for the newly created career development division of the Greater Detroit Chapter of the American Society for Training and Development.

Besides being a training associate with Odiorne Associates, Mrs. DeRoche is an experienced family therapist at Midwest Clinic in Plymouth where she specializes in treating chemically dependent families and career needs of recovering alcoholics.

The couple has team-taught workshops in interpersonal communications for couples and have developed a new workshop designed to meet the emerging problems and decisions of dual career families.

Job desires surveyed

Getting a good job that provides financial security.

That's the first priority of academically superior, first-time college freshmen residing in the metropolitan Detroit area, according to the University of Michigan-Dearborn.

UM-D, which draws heavily from the western Wayne County suburbs, said 708 out of 801 of it first-time freshmen were polled by the American Council on Education and UCLA.

"GETTING A better job" was cited by 78.7 percent of those surveyed. Nationally, 78.1 gave the same response.

Some 94.5 percent of the UM-D group indicated a high school grade-point average of B or better. The national average was 66.7 percent.

Among UM-D freshmen, 66.9 percent said they ranked in the top 20 percent of their high school classes. The national average was 32.9 percent.

The top 10 "feeder" high schools for UM-D in fall of 1979 were:

Bentley, Livonia; Dearborn and Edsel Ford, Dearborn; Bishop Borgess, a regional school in Redford; Churchill, Livonia.

Also, Fordson, Dearborn; Trenton; Allen Park; Divine Child, Dearborn; and Taylor Central.

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Gifted pupils, like others, need stimulation in class

Good education for the creative means excellent education for all children. That was the message heard by more than 100 parents and educators last

week in Plymouth from Ed Bantell, Ph.D., professor of psychology and education at Oakland University. Dr. Bantell spoke on "The Unmotivated Gifted Child" at the Feb. 13

meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Association for the Academically Talented. The creatively gifted child combines above-average intelligence with originality, said Bantell. "He makes music from silence."

Bantell, an educational consultant at national, state, and local levels, labeled most existing gifted programs as being "adult pleasing."

Many students back off from such programs, he said, and don't want to be bothered. Instead a classroom environment, rich in stimulation, is needed by all children and may be the best approach to teaching the gifted. The creative child often needs priva-

cy and resists being singled out or separated from his classmates, continued Bantell. He will hide his ability, appearing to be average or below. Because of this, warned Bantell, care must be taken to avoid early labelling which "may force the creative underground."

"Competition does not motivate the creative child, and meaningless repetition is the quickest way to kill creativity."

"Creative children will not perform just for a grade nor will they display intelligence if all that is gained is an additional 20 math problems."

"Children should do only as much repetitive work as needed to master a

skill," said Bantell who urged parents to resist the argument that repetitive work teaches a child to finish a task.

"The creatively gifted will often accept a failing grade rather than meet what they see as unreasonable requirements."

Bantell urged the community to protect the creativity of its children. "Too often the term gifted implies a person has been given gifts and, therefore, needs nothing more."

"We must not simply train children of high intelligence — we must begin to encourage creativity."

The speaker outlined three periods in a life when creative potential is highest:

- The first three to six years when the personality core is laid down.
 - Puberty, when the person modifies elements of personality developed during the first six years, and
 - Mid-life, when the individual re-evaluates life's meaning.
- Bantell listed parent and teacher observation as extremely important indicators of creativity. But, he warned, too often observations of intelligence and creativity are "thrown away or minimized."
- "The emergence of creativity within the child often is treated by the world outside the child as an emergency — causing the child to draw back on his creativity."

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Alice's blacksmith essay makes her shoe-in winner

"The American Revolutionary War would not have been won without the help of the blacksmiths."

This is the opinion of eighth grade historian Alice Schlaepfer of Riley Junior High School in Livonia.

Peering back into history, Alice learned that not only did these brawny pioneers make anchors for ships, hoops for barrels and shoes for horses, they also cast cannon and gun barrels.

Her research in the social studies class of Delores McManamon was inspired by an American history essay contest conducted by the John Sackett Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The title assigned was "Industries and Trades during the American Revolution."

Alice's essay on blacksmiths made her one of the winners of the contest. Runners-up in her school were Douglas Otsuji, who explored the importance of mills which ground flour, and Abraham Yaffai, who looked into the iron industry.

"Alice's essay was well organized, well written and fluent," said Carolyn Kerwin, DAR contest chairwoman. The essays were judged on the basis of historical accuracy, adherence to subject, originality, interest, neatness, spelling and punctuation. Alice's article will be sent on for further judging to the state DAR chairwoman. It then will be judged on state, divisional and national levels by a panel of three non-DAR judges.

"I like learning stuff," said Alice. "The blacksmiths were pretty interesting. I like writing a lot. I plan to go to college to study to be a vet."

FROM UNDER THEIR spreading chestnut trees, these early pioneers in the practical use of metals bent and twisted iron into a variety of shapes that they were essential in the daily life of early Americans. Horsepower was the main means of locomotion then. The blacksmith kept the horses' hooves in working order.

"It was a difficult job that required a lot of care," wrote Alice in her essay. The metal was heated on the forge by the blacksmith. "When it was red, he

removed it from the fire and started to bend it."

It was then fitted to the hoof at hand, and the metal hammered into the correct shape so it fit snugly.

"If the shoeing wasn't done properly, the horse may not be able to trot or gallop correctly, if at all," said Alice.

When the shot was fired that was heard 'round the world, and the Revolutionary War started, it was important that men like General Washington be able to move around fast. Blacksmiths were in demand both for shoeing horses and for making armaments as well.

The casting of cannons and gun barrels required a lot of skill, said Alice's report.

"The barrel had to be heated and shaped until everything fit together. This was a time-consuming project. If there was a flaw in the workmanship, the cannon or gun may not fire properly."

If these blacksmiths had not been so skillful in this task, there would doubtless have been fewer soldiers left to become ancestors of today's DAR members.

IN HIS SPARE TIME the smithy would make his anvil ring with the sound of his beating into shape useful items as axes, latches, hinges, locks, nails, weathervanes, andirons, gates, fences, and grills, according to Alice.

These items today are treasured by antique collectors, who also hunt for the tools of the blacksmith trade, the anvil, puncher, ball peen, swage and hasp tongs.

While Alice was boning up on blacksmiths, Abraham was investigating iron and its many by-products. Douglas was learning that water pressure hitting a paddlewheel turned a rod which turned a series of gears that turned the stone that ground the wheat that filled the stomachs of the early colonists.

"Sometimes extra grain fell into a box the miller put there, and he either used it or sold it," said Douglas. "Other times millers took part of the milled product for their toll."

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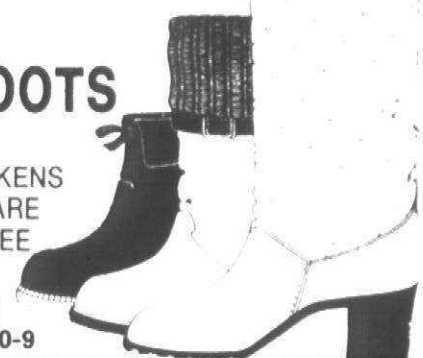
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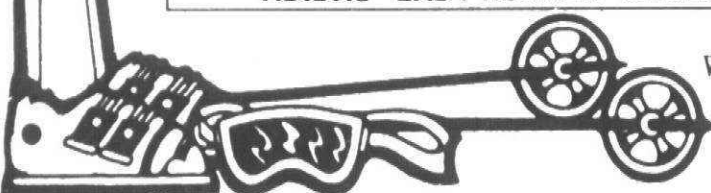
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Learn how to manage time, stress, packing

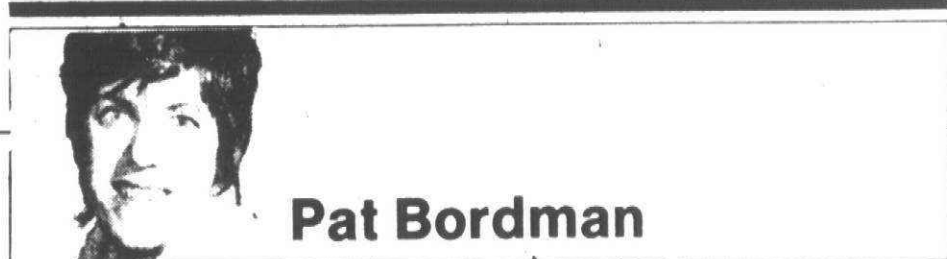
to help recently divorced persons cope with a new range of sexual relationships and intimate lifestyles. The fee is \$10.

These 'athletes' can really push hard

The Olympics. Winning. The push to the top. Competition. Children learn and absorb this aspect of the big games regardless of our own personal involvement or feelings.

They will hear it on the car radio and see it on television. Others will speak of the Olympics. And since the experience is unavoidable, we might as well take advantage of its lessons.

The Olympics represent the supreme effort of the individual, even in group competition. The bob-sledders and the hockey players struggle as a group. But even the figure skaters and speed skaters feel a collective urge to succeed.

THE POWER of team work and the singular effort of the individual can be dramatically demonstrated at home. We'll call our project the Seed-Lympics.

Take a handful of lima bean seeds or other Large and fast-growing seeds. Soak them overnight in water.

Line a jewelry box or small shoe-box with foil. If a shoe box is used, crumple some additional foil and put it in the box. This will act as additional fill as well as drainage. Fill the

box to the top with potting soil.

Now press the water-soaked seeds one by one into the soil, spreading them evenly around the center of the box. Moisten the soil thoroughly with water, cover with plastic wrap and put the lid on the box.

The plastic wrap will prevent the soil from drying out.

NOW COMES the wait. In just a few days, the power of the seedlings

will push the box top right off. You can call it the desire to succeed, and the push to the top is shown graphically.

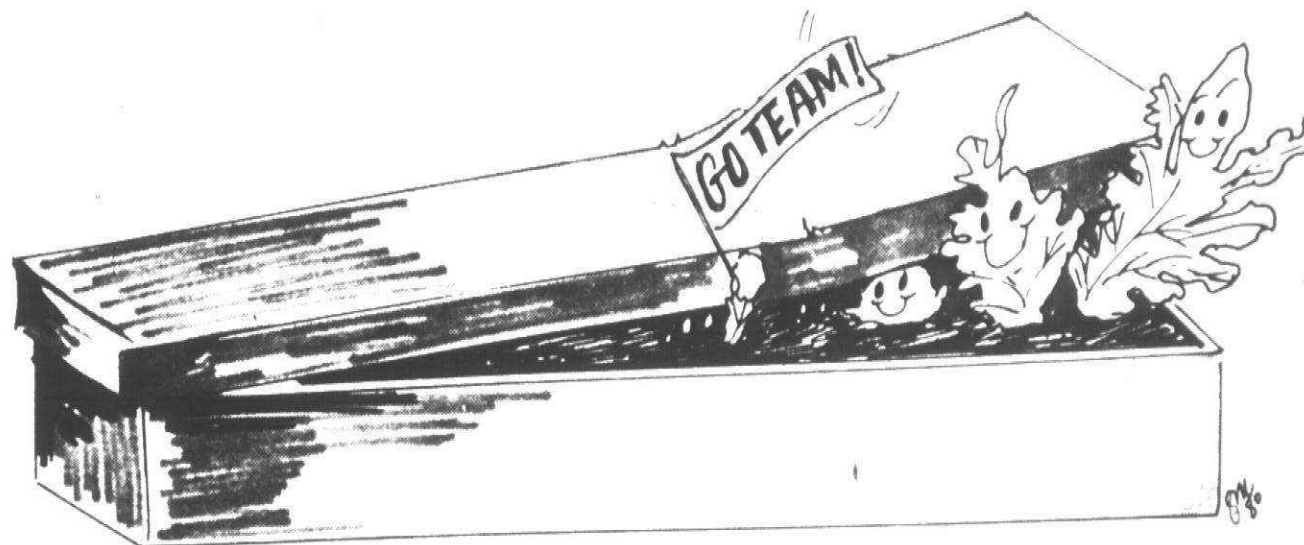

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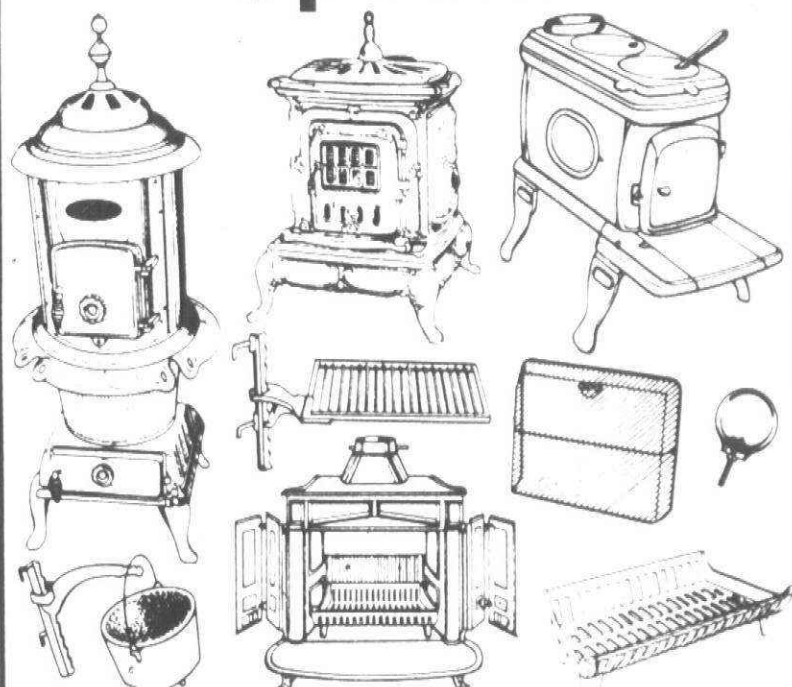
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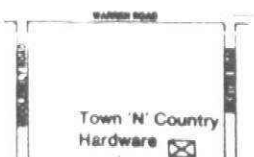

A Hollywood wish becomes reality for local composer

Somebody or something — the gods, the stars, the good fairies — was smiling when Martin Scot Kosins boarded the plane for Los Angeles in December.

A Detroit area classical composer and former supper club pianist, the 32-year-old Kosins has two of his compositions on record. The first album, "Shadows of the Heart" with Marjorie Gordon and members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, is on the Orion label. The second, which came out a year ago, is "Love Letters," a dialogue for flute and piano featuring flutist David Shostac and pianist Anita Swearingin on Crystal Records.

Kosins carried some of his taped compositions to California in the hopes that he could be considered to do sound tracks for movies.

The day he arrived opened auspiciously. He happened to pick up a copy of the Los Angeles Times and saw a review of "Love Letters." Later, leafing through the December issue of Fanfare magazine, he spotted a review of the two-year-old "Shadows of the Heart."

"I had to go to Los Angeles to see those things," he said, "even though while in Detroit I worried that I hadn't gotten to the coast in two years."

It was exciting to discover his worries were unfounded, he said. "Everything that happened on this trip took place because of the 'Love Letters' album," he said.

He met jazz and pop flutist Bud Shank, whom he admired for many years. Shank plays in Los Angeles with a group called The Orchestra. Kosins was in the process of forming his own recording and publishing company, Open Sky. After hearing the album for flute and piano, Shank readily agreed to do some recording for the new company. The Orchestra asked Kosins to write a composition for two flutes and orchestra for their repertoire.

Then came a letter from another flutist, Mark Thomas, who informed the composer that he was recording "Love Letters" and it was scheduled for release in August.

Another internationally known flutist, James Galway, contacted Kosins

about doing an arrangement of "Love Letters" for flute and string orchestra.

Open Sky was formed initially so Kosins could record his own compositions, but he doesn't rule out expanding beyond that idea. As the plans for the venture went together quickly, Kosins thought about his first record album. Certainly, "Songs of the Seeker," one of his favorites, would be on it. This piece for chamber orchestra and narrator was premiered in Detroit on the Laundslager Music Series last April. Kosins said he wrote the narrator's part with his movie hero, John Carridine, in mind.

Why not contact Carridine's agent, what did he have to lose, he asked himself. After listening to the tapes, the actor's agent responded favorably to the idea.

Floating along on that tentative approval, Kosins and some friends went out to dinner the next evening and found themselves seated near a table occupied by Carridine and his two sons. Since luck had been running with him, Kosins decided to test it one more time. He approached Carridine and told him about "Songs of the Seeker."

"He was so gracious," said Kosins, "and he has a way of hanging on every word you say."

Carridine said yes; if his agent liked it, he would do it.

THE FIRST ALBUM of the new company was taking shape rapidly. It would include "Songs of the Seeker" with Carridine as narrator, "Love Letters" and a new composition, "Winter Moods for Flute." The side with Carridine and Shank will be recorded in Los Angeles and the flip side in Detroit.

"It will all take place this summer and mid-fall," said Kosins.

In the meantime, three producers have told Kosins they are considering him for soundtrack work and he is negotiating to do a second score for a children's program in the 1980 Meadow Brook Music Festival.

It would seem as though Kosins didn't have to go to Los Angeles to be discovered. It had found him before he arrived and was just waiting for him to show up last December.

Sixteen fellows from the western suburbs come from different walks of life and have a bevy of individual activities. But they all have one thing in common and one evening a week together when only emergencies or other matters of equal urgency take preference.

"A lot of people make a party out of it, and I've never heard of anyone who went away without having enjoyed themselves; that's the kind of event it is."

The word is casual for today's lifestyle

From Madison Avenue to Madison, Wis., and beyond, casual is becoming a 24 hour a day lifestyle. New York's Madison Avenue, for example, used to be the land of the gray flannel suit. Today it's the land of the jogging suit.

And all those joggers and tennis players, squash players and backpackers aren't coming to Hepplewhite and Louis XVI drawing rooms. They're coming home to casual, comfortable rooms.

If you want to go from a formal decorating style to something more casual, here are a few starting points.

Replace heavy drapery treatments with shades or blinds. Or do away with window treatments altogether assuming they're not needed for light control or privacy. Take down that damask or flocked wallpaper and repaper walls with textured paper, the suede look, grass or other fiber. If paint is your preference, stucco paint or textured sand paint is the thing to use.

Casual calls for a pair of wood-framed beach chairs or deck chairs with colorfully striped or solid-colored sling seats. If that's too casual for you, re-do your upholstery with something in a textured fabric, something you wouldn't hesitate to sit on, lounge and be comfortable with.

TAKE UP YOUR wall-to-wall carpeting if there's wood under it and adorn that wood floor with wool or straw scatter rugs. If you carpet, choose one of today's nubby Berber-look wall to walls carpets. It will take a little care and a lot of abuse. Slipcover your moire, satin, damask or silk-cov-

ered furniture with washable canvas, or chintz.

Store your ornate Louis lamps in the attic. Purchase replacements of rope, wicker, brass or beaten copper, or go the track lighting route. Lighting should be unobtrusive.

Make sure everything you buy is easy care. Unpolished, distressed woods, washable upholstery fabrics, wipe down mica laminates, and dust off window treatments are all excellent choices. That's if you are looking for real "casual."

Add, subtract, multiply, and divide. That may not sound much like a formula for decorating but it can be, and often is, the solution for decorating problems and changes.

ADD new-looking colors and accessories to a tired old room. If walls are "eggish" color, paint them frosty white. Navy and white upholstery colors and old ginger jar green lamps can become white with a can of spray.

SUBTRACT unnecessary clutter from your life. Subtract the unattractive, often as important to decorating as adding the beautiful. Subtract the clutter of little pictures that hang over the sofa and replace it with one, large, handsome print. Subtract all odds and ends, bric a brac, dust collectors and see how much space you have found.

MULTIPLY your space by shopping for furniture and accessories that do double and triple duty. Instead of just a coffee table, shop for a coffee table with a drawer or cupboard space below. Shop for a convertible sofa for the family room, dual purpose.

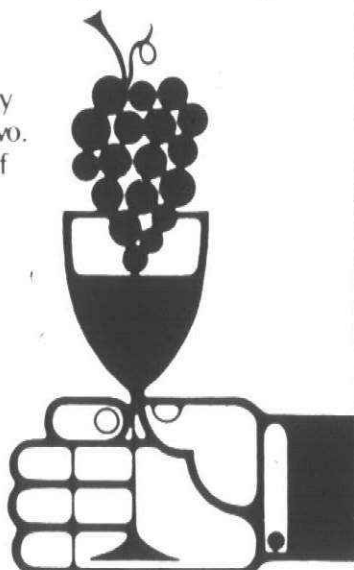

Stream fishing clinic offered by new club

Stream fishing for steelhead trout and salmon may be one of the most rigorous of all outdoor sports. It's also an art.

A free clinic is being offered from noon to 6 p.m. Sunday, March 2 in Westland's Melvin G. Bailey Recreation Center on Ford Road east of Newburgh, directly behind city hall. No reservations are needed; just show up.

Co-sponsors are the Westland Parks and Recreation Department and a year-old group called the Metro-West chapter of the Michigan Steelhead and Salmon Fisherman's Association.

"The clinic will cover all method of stream fishing for steelhead trout and salmon," said President Arthur H. Dittmar Jr.

He gave examples: "Stream equipment, rods and reels, drift baits, spinner making, trolling methods, best lures and attractors, downriggers, electronic equipment, rod building, reel maintenance, fish preparation, fly tying and fish filleting."

The U.S. Coast Guard will show a film on boating safety and have information on boat safety equipment.

THE METRO-WEST chapter of the Michigan Steelhead and Salmon Fisherman's Association was formed only last April, Art Dittmar said.

"We have 117 members, and we may reach 200 in no time," the Farmington Hills resident and Garden City West High School teacher said.

"We have boat outings, stream tournaments and contests against other chapters. Our membership comes mainly from the suburbs west of Telegraph Road.

"Our regular meetings are 7:30 p.m. the first Tuesday of each month in the Holiday Inn on Plymouth Road west of Middlebelt in Livonia. Sure, prospective members are welcome."

The chapter has just voted to affiliate with Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

MICHIGAN'S new state transportation map is rolling off the presses with the billing that it's "the most complete transportation map the state has ever produced." So says Hannes Meyers Jr., chairman of the State Transportation Commission.

I find the same old flaw: State parks are shown, but national forests are omitted. Once again, the outdoorsman

This year the upper peninsula gets its dues. There are photos of Lake of the Clouds, The Bridge, Tahquamenon Falls, Pictured Rocks and the Soo canal. "Down below" is represented by

Holland's tulips and windmill, Ren Cen and Greenfield Village.

A new feature is a map of downtown Detroit. That's an improvement.

And for the first time, there is a special map showing inter-city bus and rail passenger routes and locations of airports with commercial service.

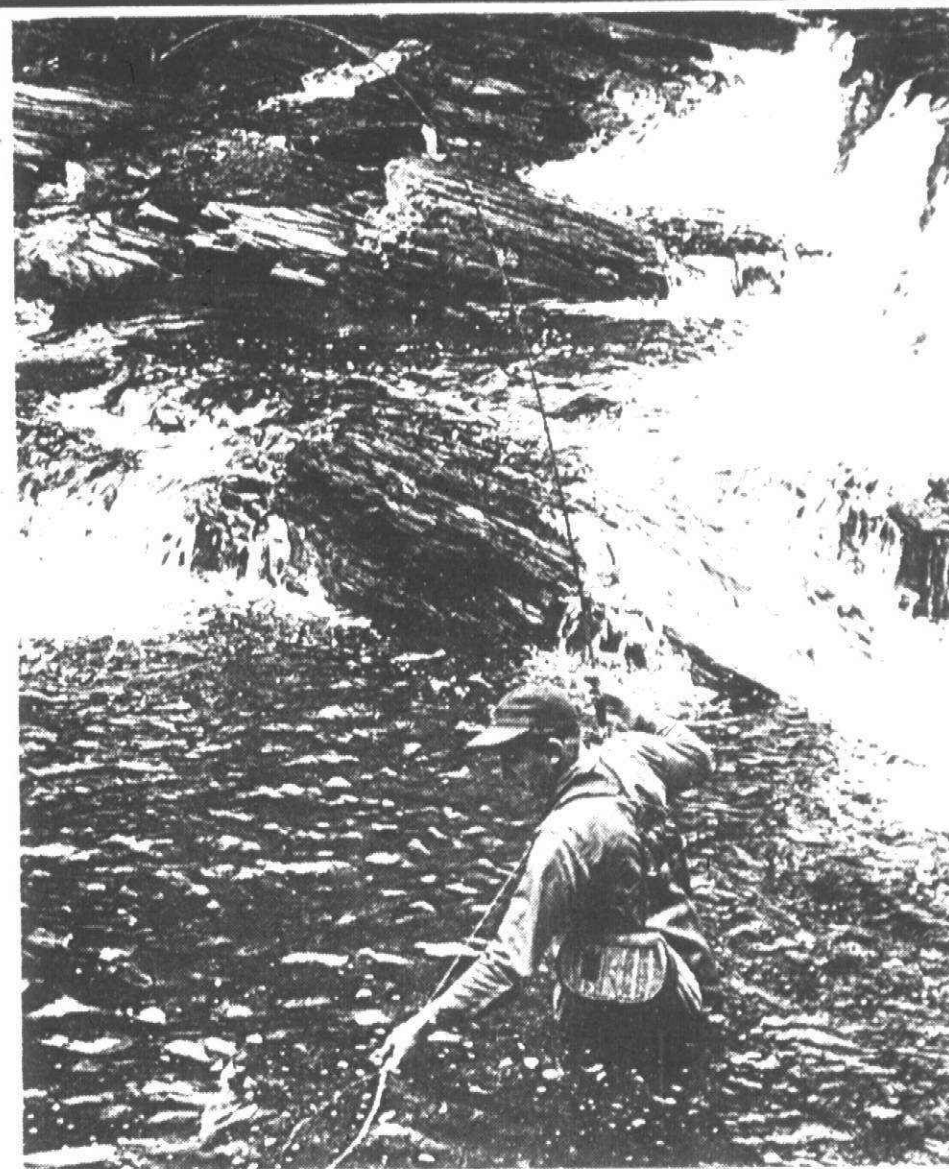
A **NATURE** counselors training camp is being offered June 6-10 at Camp Ann Behrens, Greenville, by three organizations.

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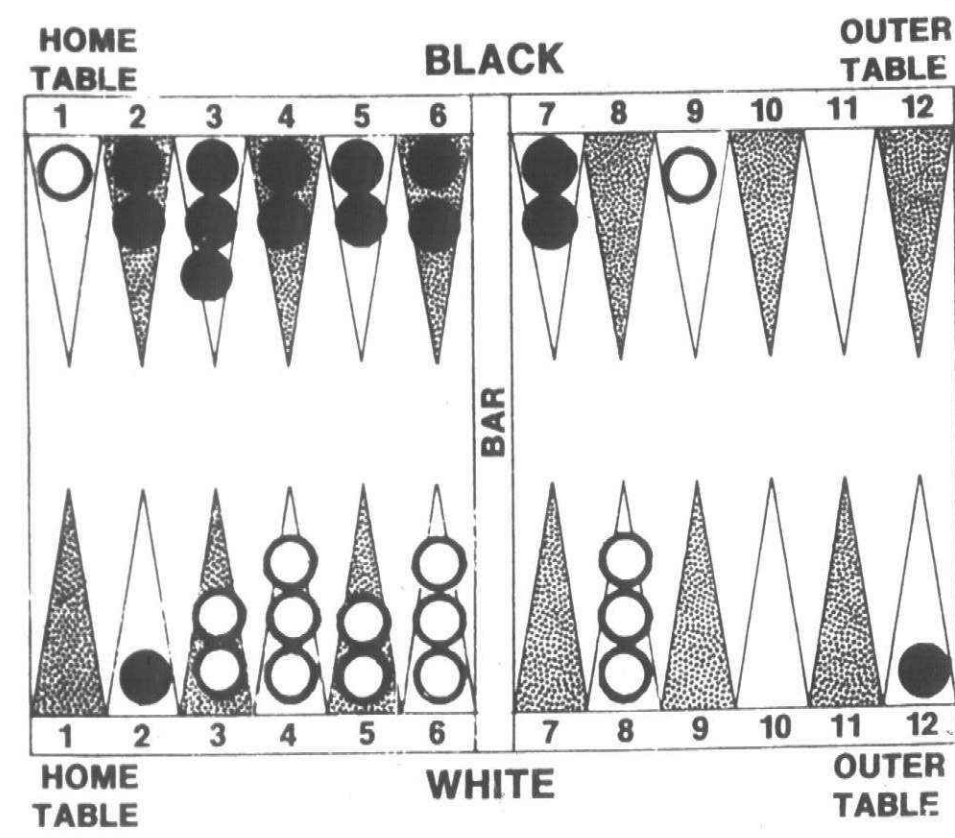

FORMING A PRIME
One basic objective while playing backgammon is to form a prime (a blockade of closed points) in front of your opponent — preferably a six-point (full) prime, as in the example.

A five-point prime is also very good. Depending on the overall position, the game is not entirely lost if you are stuck behind a prime.

When both players have a full prime, however, the only way to win is to force your opponent to break his prime first. You can do this by moving your free men slowly around the board, hoping your opponent moves at a quicker pace.

Given the proper situation, it would not be wise then to slow your opponent by hitting. In some cases, however, hitting may speed him up.

Timing — maintaining free checker movement — is therefore critical. Also important are the number of men trapped and the length of the prime.

White rolls six-four in this position. How would you play it?

INSTINCT IMMEDIATELY spots a hit and a closed 2 point. This move may defeat your purpose, however, if black gets off the bar and covers the blot on the 12 point. White cannot afford this risk. Passing over black with the six-four is not very constructive.

Hitting black on the 2 point is a sure bet with the builder (extra checker) on the 8 point. Also a good move is hitting black with the four roll on the 12 point.

Why? White wants to be hit. This will slow him down, especially if he remains on the bar. But when black finally re-enters his second checker from the bar, he is a strong favorite to break open his bar point with the remaining half-roll.

No one is saying white will win this game hands down, but he has excellent prospects.

'Joe Egg': A fine play with a message

There are a few times each year when you see a play or a movie that makes a difference in your life.

Not that you become a crusading evangelist; rather, you become aware of a real problem within your moral and intellectual world. You are elevated as a person.

"A Day in the Death of Joe Egg" is one of those experiences.

Presented by the Theater Guild of Livonia-Redford, this sensitive and pointed comedy deals with the effect on a marriage from 10 years of raising a child who has severe cerebral palsy.

Author Peter Nichols has written a superb script. Filled with deep feeling, it deliberates the hardships and the joy that a child who has been reduced to a parsnip can have on an average young married couple.

There are two contrasting points of view and Nichols depicts them through two contrasting personalities.

FIRST, THE problem. Joe (played so well by Michael Hineman), is for all outwardly signs a vegetable. Given to epileptic fits, poor Joe has been confined to a wheelchair for all of her 10 years.

She has never spoken, never heard nor understood any form of communication or stimuli. She is not toilet trained nor able to initiate or control any physical movement.

In a biting satirical manner, the father, Brian (played brilliantly by Dale Feldspausch), tries to escape the reality of Joe Egg by suppressing his emotions via jokes.

He mimics and at times makes up whole conversations with his hapless daughter. He will take nothing seriously. Any discussion as to "hope for the dear thing" or "faith being an avenue to relieve the soul" is scoffed at.

Brian wishes that his daughter were someplace else. He doesn't want to deal with her any more. He has lost all interest in her.

On the other hand, Joe's mother, Sheila (played equally well by Sandi Martin), loves her child and is willing to wait for the miracle that may some day "let Joe run around like the other children."

She has not given up hope; she has not quit. Hers is a world filled with life, not given to the cynicism that prevails in Brian's world.

BOTH LOVE each other and both in their own way try to keep the marriage

together. But Brian feels trapped and can only seek to escape.

First he tries to escape Joe. In this he fails. Next, he even tries to kill Joe. In this too he fails. In the end, he is forced to escape not only Joe but the marriage that has become Joe. In this he succeeds.

Brian is depicted as selfish, a mama's boy. While true on the surface, it is Nichols' way of saying that parents are human too, that it might be better to put Joe in an institution — as harsh and uncharitable as it may sound — in order for the marriage to survive and for the living to go on.

Sheila loves her husband but loves her child more. She plays along with Brian's vaudevillian parodies. Sheila carries no malice. She is tortured by her own guilt — a guilt that only a mother could carry.

Did she carry the baby wrong? Did her promiscuous past give way to a guilt that she was unfit to be a mother? Did she therefore hold back during delivery, causing Joe's illness?

Add to this the mother-in-law (Marion Tournaud), who is ready to blame Sheila. After all, it couldn't have been her son's fault.

IT IS HARD to imagine all this as a

comedy, but director Ron Worsley has done a marvelous job capturing the guts of this play. The best is quick and decisive. The movement, the set and the English accents are mature and compatible.

Worsley has laid the way for the audience to participate and feel for both sides without taking a position. He has allowed Brian to be as right as Sheila.

The play, after all, is a comedy; to make such subtle yet demanding points is no easy task for cast or director.

Sandi Martin and Dale Feldspausch, while seemingly nervous at first, settle down to give one of the best performances seen this year in community theater — or professional theater, for that matter. They are sincere, they are funny, and they are human.

Michael, who happens to be just 9 years old, is charming as Joe. She becomes the beautiful child turnip, drawing us to her as she emotes in us the helplessness of her state.

Michael maintains her hypnotic state of lifelessness while she is pushed, shoved and carried about the stage. She is a real trooper.

ROUNDING OUT this cast, Marion Tournaud is very good as the selfish and insensitive mother-in-law. As with

all good supporting actresses, Tournaud puts in one of those performances that complete a show and make it a play. She grates on our nerves, just as she grates on poor Sheila.

Carole McNulty and Ron Samuel are also fine as Pam and Freddie, Sheila's married friends. McNulty plays a rich woman of the suburbs who simply doesn't want to see or be bothered with reality. Her children are fine and healthy and that's all the matters to her.

Out of sight, out of mind. Hence no problem.

Samuel, as Freddie, is the selfish rich do-gooder. A proclaimed socialist, he goes to every \$100-a-plate charity dinner. He is more than willing to tell everyone else how to solve their problems.

It's easy for him; he sees it all so clearly. He can't understand why people can't see it. Perhaps it's because they aren't on his yacht.

McNulty and Samuel are both excellent in their supportive roles. They lend a contrast in style and their upbeat performances create a uniquely prescribed definition of character necessary to bring out the subtleties in Brian and Sheila.

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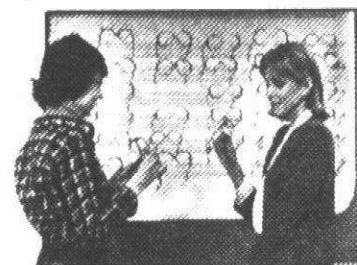
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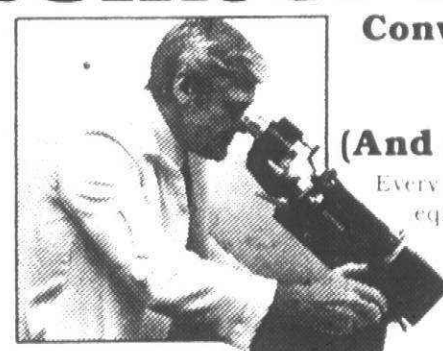
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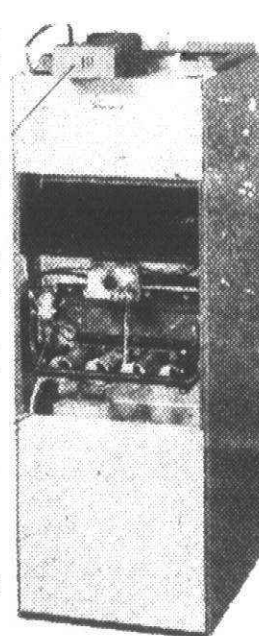
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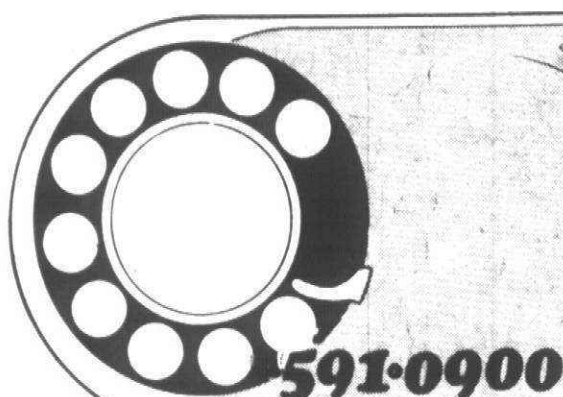
