## Advisors say 1 court will ease space crunch

Setting up just one main courthouse to serve five communities in the 35th District has been proposed by an advisory group looking into "courthouse blues."

Studying such problems as overcrowding, lack of office space, and soaring administrative costs, the group last week was unanimous in supporting a main courthouse. Representatives were from Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Canton Township, Northville and Northville Township.

Presently, the court is scattered in three separate locations in the city of Plymouth, Canton Township and Northville. Two district court judges — Dunbar Davis and James Garber — move among those locations.

Except for Canton Township, the other two municipalities say they no longer can accommodate courtrooms within their prospective city halls.

After meeting Thursday, group members agreed to go back to their respective communities to gather support for the plan from officials there.

Additionally, they will be asking for feed-back on three proposed sites for that new construction. So far, four sites have been proposed although one was disqualified by members Thursday.

**PROPOSED BY** Henry Graper, Plymouth city manager, was a site on Main Street across from the Kroger Shopping Center. It was disqualified when members disliked its proximity to the C&O railroad crossing just 200 feet away.

Three sites remain in the running,

however: on Plymouth Road near Massey Field in Plymouth; on the northwest corner of Haggerty and Joy roads in Plymouth Township; and on a third site on Joy and Mortan Taylor roads in Canton Township.

Graper said he expects the committee will be getting word on the costs of the lands and their developments in mid-March.

"I think we'll be getting closer to a site recommendation and some cost figures then," he said.

Attending last week's meeting were: Graper, Judge Davis, Trustee Maurice Breen from Plymouth Township, Clerk John Flodin from Canton Township and Don Thomson, a trustee from Northville Township.

According to Garber, who called for this type of advisory committee, a consolidated 35th District Court plan won over two other considerations for solving the court's problems.

One possibility was to divide the court district into two or three halves or even three sections.

A third possibility was to keep the same system but add fourth courtroom in a community presently without one like Northville Township.

"IT ONLY took us 30 seconds into our first meeting before we decided to stick together," Garber said.

According to his estimates, court costs throughout the district could be reduced by some \$100,000 annually if one courthouse served all five communities. Even before the committee started meeting, Garber favored this approach.

Throughout the district, last year's case load totaled some 26,000 with both

Plymouth and Canton Township hearing some 10,000 each and another 6,000 heard in Northville.

The cost of running a court now falls on the municipality that houses it and consequently that community gets the major amount of revenues generated from convicted violators of local ordinances.

If a state law is violated, any generated fines revert back to the state.

There are two small adjustments, however, in places like Northville and Plymouth Townships whose cases are heard in their neighboring city.

In these two cases, two-thirds of the fines and costs revert to the cities of Plymouth and Northville with the remaining third going to the township.

Under a unified courthouse plan, this process would be streamlined, Garber said.

**EACH OF THE** five communities would contribute to its support according to the number of cases generated in that community. Conversely, any fines paid to the court on those cases would revert back to the community of origin.

As to the funding of constructing a new central courthouse, Garber says there are several plans under consideration by the committee.

"I think we can overcome that hurdle without a large capital outlay."

One approach is to secure federal funding. Another is to secure a long-term land contract whereby administrative savings could smoothly handle this cost over many years.

The committee also is looking to local economic development corporations for help in initial funding of such a project.

## Petition drive plan abandoned by Roberts

Resident Gary Roberts has abandoned the idea of staging a petition drive for a farmland preservation election.

He pledged to spearhead the drive Jan. 22 after the township board rejected his request for a farmland ballot question in either May or August.

But Roberts, an opponent of farmland preservation, changed his mind about a petition campaign after Clerk John Flodin said that the drive would not force the township board to include the issue on the ballot.

Lawrence Verbiest, director of the Wayne County Election Commission, said township residents lack the authority to force elections on most issues. Only some issues, such as the recall of public officials, must be placed on the ballot as a result of a petition campaign.

"You could like this to someone petitioning for a stop light," said Flodin of the farmland preservation question. "There's nothing in law that demands putting something like this on a ballot by reason of a petition drive."

Flodin added, however, that "it might be hard for the township board" to deny a public referendum if a substantial number of citizens petitioned for a vote.

**ROBERTS SAYS** he will not waste his time collecting petitions which could be dumped into the wastebasket.

A defeated trustee candidate in the 1978 election, Roberts plans to run for some township office next November. He plans to include his opposition to farmland preservation in his political campaign.

He endorses a decision that would decide the farmland

issue once and for all and maintains that a ballot question should be presented to voters this year.

The township board shelved his request for a repetition of a 1978 ballot question last month, however.

In 1978, voters narrowly defeated a four-mill tax request (\$4 per \$1,000 assessed property valuation) for the purchase of development rights on some 5,000 acres west of Canton Center. The township board resolved to present another proposal to voters by May, 1981.

Township board members oppose scheduling another election before that time unless all avenues for non-local funding have been explored.

Roberts maintains that the expected adoption of a zoning ordinance next month will lead to expensive litigation unless a program to compensate landowners for their lost development rights has been adopted. The proposed zoning ordinance reserves much of the land in Canton's western half for farmland.

Roberts favors zoning the land for homesites of a half acre or more.

**FLODIN SAID** residents of most cities could petition for the ballot question which Roberts is seeking. Most city charters give citizens the right to petition for a wide range of election issues.

"Cities are truly self-governed," Flodin said. But townships, even charter townships like Canton, have limitations imposed by state law."

## The circus comes to town

Circus troupes also will travel to the Twelve Oaks Mall at 1:30 p.m. March 8.

Featured performers in the mini circus are the high-strutting brass band with colorful uniforms and clowns, including the Keystone Kops and Motor Corp.

Those are just a few of the more than 30 acts performing in this year's Shrine Circus from March 14-30

at the State Fair Colliseum. This year marks the 72nd year that the Moslem Temple, the local Shrine organization, has invited the circus to town.

The 17-day stay in Detroit includes performances at 1:30 and 7:30 p.m. daily, and at 9:30 a.m. on Saturdays and on March 23.

Tickets, which range from \$4-\$6, are now on sale at ticket offices at the fair grounds, Hudson's, Sears, Wards and Bank of the Commonwealth. For group rates, contact the colliseum ticket office.

Proceeds from the circus are used by the Moslem Temple primarily to help transport burned and crippled children from southeastern Michigan to Shrine hospitals.

Other acts in the 2½ hour performance will include Satani Demon who dives blindfolded through a fiery spinning wheel of sharp knives, Gaylord Maynard and his Apple Jack drinking Apaloosa horse Barpaw, and Hugo Zacchini who will be hurled from a giant cannon.

## Mall fire was arson, chief says

Arson is the cause of the fire that gutted the Penniman Avenue Shops Feb. 16, according to Plymouth Fire Chief Roy Hall.

Two adjoining businesses were also severely damaged in the blaze.

Suspicions of arson by local authorities, aroused as early as a week ago Sunday while the fire was still in progress, were confirmed by lab results

from the Michigan State Police at 10 a.m. Friday.

According to Hall, there are no suspects at this time. The investigation is in the hands of the Plymouth Police

# Board may adopt new student code

A revised student code of conduct may be approved at today's meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the board offices at 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth.

The meeting also will be broadcast beginning with a pre-board show at 7:25 p.m. on WSDP (88.1 FM), the student-operated radio station.

The revised student code was drafted by a committee of parents, students, teachers and administrators to bring it up to date with changes in state law and regulations.

The board also will be discussing the 1979-80 Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) test results. This is a statewide test of reading and math skills administered to fourth, sixth and tenth graders.

The school board also will receive a status report on the current operating budget from the business department.

THE STUDENT code deals with behavior standards expected of students at the elementary, middle and high school levels.

Subject areas include bike safety, playground behavior, respect for personal property, vandalism, weapons, fire alarms, drugs, dress, restitution for damaged property and what can be expected of students, parents, teachers and principals.

The code also addresses such things as tardiness and truancy, smoking and alcohol abuse, fighting, extortion and gambling, physical threats, protection against unreasonable search and seizures, freedom of speech, assembly and publication.

The high school code proposes for establishment of a student conduct committee to review issues or problems relating to student behavior.

The high school code also covers procedures for student suspension and as well as responsibilities of counselors and area coordinators.

A special look inside France will be seen Wednesday night during the Travel and Adventure Series sponsored by the Plymouth Kiwanis Foundation.

The travel program will begin at 8 p.m. in the auditorium of Plymouth Salem High School on Joy just west of Canton Center Road.

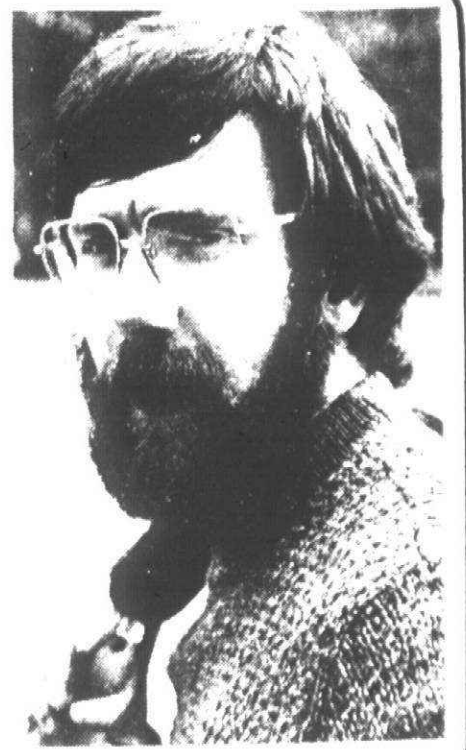
ing of a Bastille Day celebration, and a look at French sports, particularly horse racing.

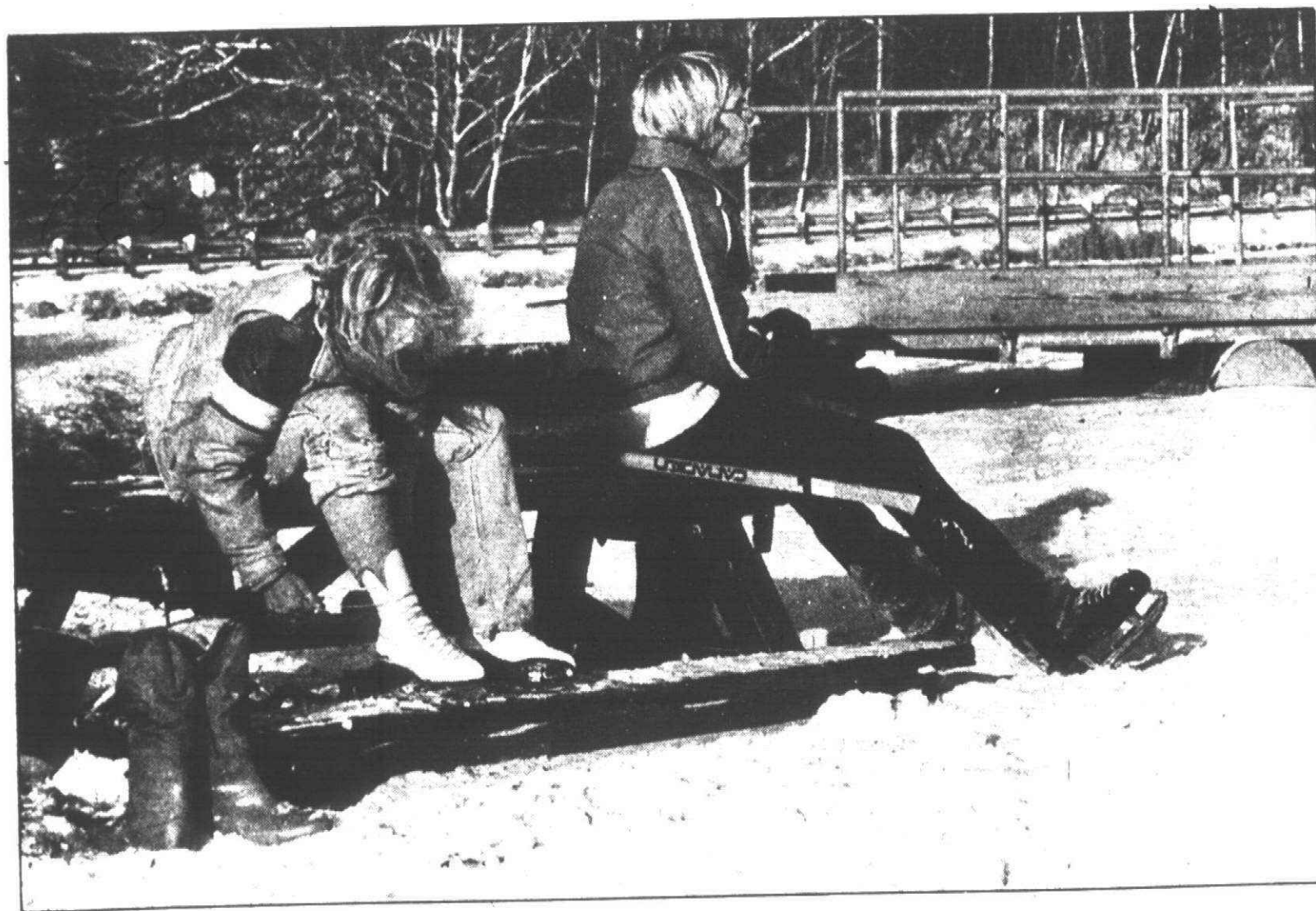

## SC courses cover drink, men, stress

Schoolcraft College will offer new continuing education courses in alcoholism, masculinity and stress management during March. The college is located at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.

An eight-week course, "Reflections in a Glass," will meet at 7 p.m. beginning March 3. Designed by the National Council on Alcoholism, the one-credit hour course will examine women and alcohol. Joyce Krause will cover factual information concerning the physical affects of alcohol, problems related to mixing alcohol with other drugs and legal aspects of drinking.

A SIX-WEEK course called "Psychology of Men and Masculinity" is also scheduled at 7 p.m. beginning March 3. Taught

"Stress Management and Relaxation Training" will be offered on Wednesdays for 10 weeks from 7 to 9:25 p.m. beginning March 5. Schoolcraft counselor Ron Rogowski will examine the theory of stress and analyze stress energy in the class. Participants will learn relaxation techniques which channel constructive energy produced by stressful situations.

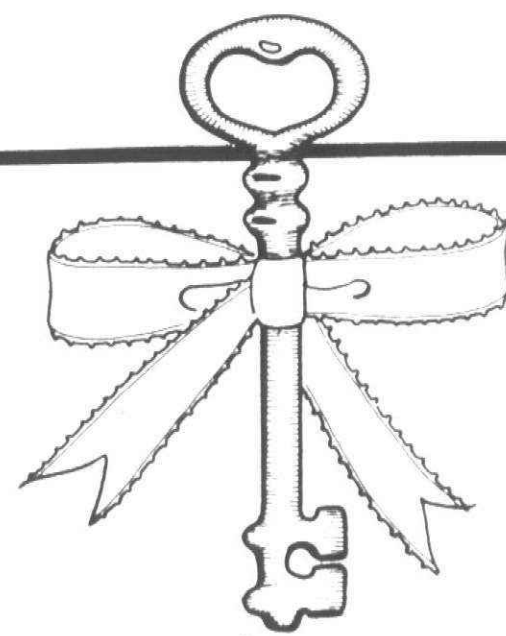

## Arsonist set mall fire, chief says

Department under the direction of Lt. Henry Berghoff.

"All the evidence we have is that there's been a crime committed," Hall said. "Period."

He also confirmed that some type of accelerant — like gasoline — was used to set the fire. It originated in a lower level rear shop called Reflections Boutique.

One of 11 small shops in the complex, the boutique faced the Central Parking Lot.

After taking samples of the floor covering and tiles there, results Friday showed an accelerant was poured over a "large area."

According to Hall, an arsonist might have any of several motives.

"It ranges from covering up another crime to revenge to fraud. That's your biggest three. As yet there is no evidence to substantiate any of those."

A key element pointing to arson, Hall said, was the "muffled explosion" that occurred seconds after the arrival of Plymouth police Lt. Bill Fletcher.

According to Fletcher, he heard the explosion coming from the rear of the building about 11:40 p.m. Saturday.

While in the front of the building, Fletcher detected a fire inside although he found the front glass panels were cold to the touch.

"In getting to the back end we found there was more damage there than in any other part of the building," Hall said.

Investigators, including state fire marshals, began looking for a "set fire" Sunday and removed some charred carpet samples and floor tiles for testing.

According to Hall, the explosion "could have been caused by a back draft, a gas leak or an accelerant."

But he said a back draft was eliminated as a cause because it would not have created "such extensive damage." Also, the back draft did not explain why Fletcher found the front windows cold to the touch upon arrival.

Gas company representatives determined last week that

there was nothing wrong with either the meters or hot water system inside.

"If that happened we would have had a severe fire with no explosion," Hall said. "So we put that one on the back shelf."

Hall added investigators were clued into a deliberately set fire when they detected an odor they couldn't explain in the rear boutique.

"HAD IT not been for the lab results we'd still be investigating the fire for arson because everything else points to it."

According to fire department records, firefighters responded to only two other calls at that location because the building was renovated some three years ago.

The first occurred in June 1978. No damage occurred when a burning rag was discovered in a street level shop facing Penniman Avenue. It was extinguished by the time firefighters arrived and its cause attributed to spontaneous combustion.

The second fire followed in July of that year. It was detected in the electrical system and resulted in minor damage to some ceiling tiles.

The last fire inspection of that building was in the fall of 1977. "It passed a clean inspection," said Hall after checking department reports.

Reflections Boutique, the largest shop in the building, was owned by Jeanne Eggenberger. It was recently expanded toward the front of the building and featured costume jewelry and designer jeans.

According to Mrs. Eggenberger's estimates, some \$30,000 worth of merchandise was destroyed.

While all shops in the complex were destroyed, the fire also spread to the Tic Toc Watch Repair and the Morrison, Stanwood and Pollak accounting firm.

According to Hall, it appeared last week that both businesses would be torn down as both shared common walls to the Penniman Shops.

Bill Morrison, owner of the accounting firm, said Friday he has found new quarters at 41850 Joy Road and plans to remain there at least through the 1981 tax season.

# Salem cagers romp to league crown

Plymouth Salem clinched its seventh straight Suburban Eight League basketball title Friday night in convincing style. The Rocks, now 16-2

overall, manhandled Trenton on the road, 83-53.

It was also Coach Fred Thomann's seventh crown in a row.

"It felt nice," Thomann said. "Each one we get is dear to me. Tonight I thought we played awfully well."

The Rocks did.

Thomann's troops started out slow, but gradually took control of the game for their ninth league win without a loss.

Salem found itself down seven points during the early stages of the first quarter.

In fact, the Rocks were even down one point before the game started.

Trenton's Devin Hart was awarded a free throw which he canned after a Salem player was called for a technical foul for dunking in the warmup.

Center Howard Monk, who led all scorers with 24 points, gave Salem the lead for good with 2:47 left in the first quarter, hitting two free throws.

Salem led after the first quarter, 16-14, and then turned on the burners during the second period of play.

Paul Horton, a thin, 6-8 reserve center, sparked the Rocks to 27-14 blitz

of Trenton in that quarter.

HE EFFECTIVELY worked the boards with Monk and senior forward Jim Anderson as Salem jumped out to a 43-28 halftime bulge.

Horton, a junior, scored eight of his career-high 12 points in the second period.

He also finished with 12 rebounds to draw praise from Thomann.

"I was very pleased with his play," said the Salem coach. "He rebounded, caught the ball and did a good job for the amount of playing time he's had this year."

The Rocks were awesome on the glass all night. Monk, a 6-6 senior, paced all rebounders with 17. He got ample support from Anderson who scored 12 points and grabbed 14 rebounds. Sophomores Scott Bublin and Mike McBride each added 10 and nine

rebounds respectively.

Many of those rebounds were a result of Trenton's poor shooting from the floor. The Trojans hit just 18 of 58 shots for 31 percent. Meanwhile, Salem connected on 32 of 68 for 44 percent.

The Rocks hit well, especially from the outside.

"Offensively we had some good shooting opportunities," said Thomann. "We hit one or two outside jumpers early and that helped our inside game. We've been working hard on our perimeter shooting in the 15- to 17-foot range."

"Tonight we got more shots than we normally do in a game." The Salem coach was also happy with his team's workmanlike performance on defense.

The Rocks received solid play from their starting guards, Rob Neu and Mike Sharp. Neu scored nine points and was credited with eight assists along with Anderson. Sharp had one field goal and hit all four free throws attempted.

In the final quarter Salem went with its kiddie corps. At one time late in the game Salem took the floor with five sophomores — Bublin, McBride, 6-5 Norm Haygood, John McDowell and Geoff Baker.

The latter three players were called up to the varsity on Wednesday after Thomann suspended three varsity reserves for the remainder of the season "because of disciplinary reasons."

"I was pleased our more experienced players gave us a big enough lead so our new players could see some action," said Thomann. "I thought those kids did a pretty good job."

Canton will meet Belleville Tuesday on the road for a non-league game.

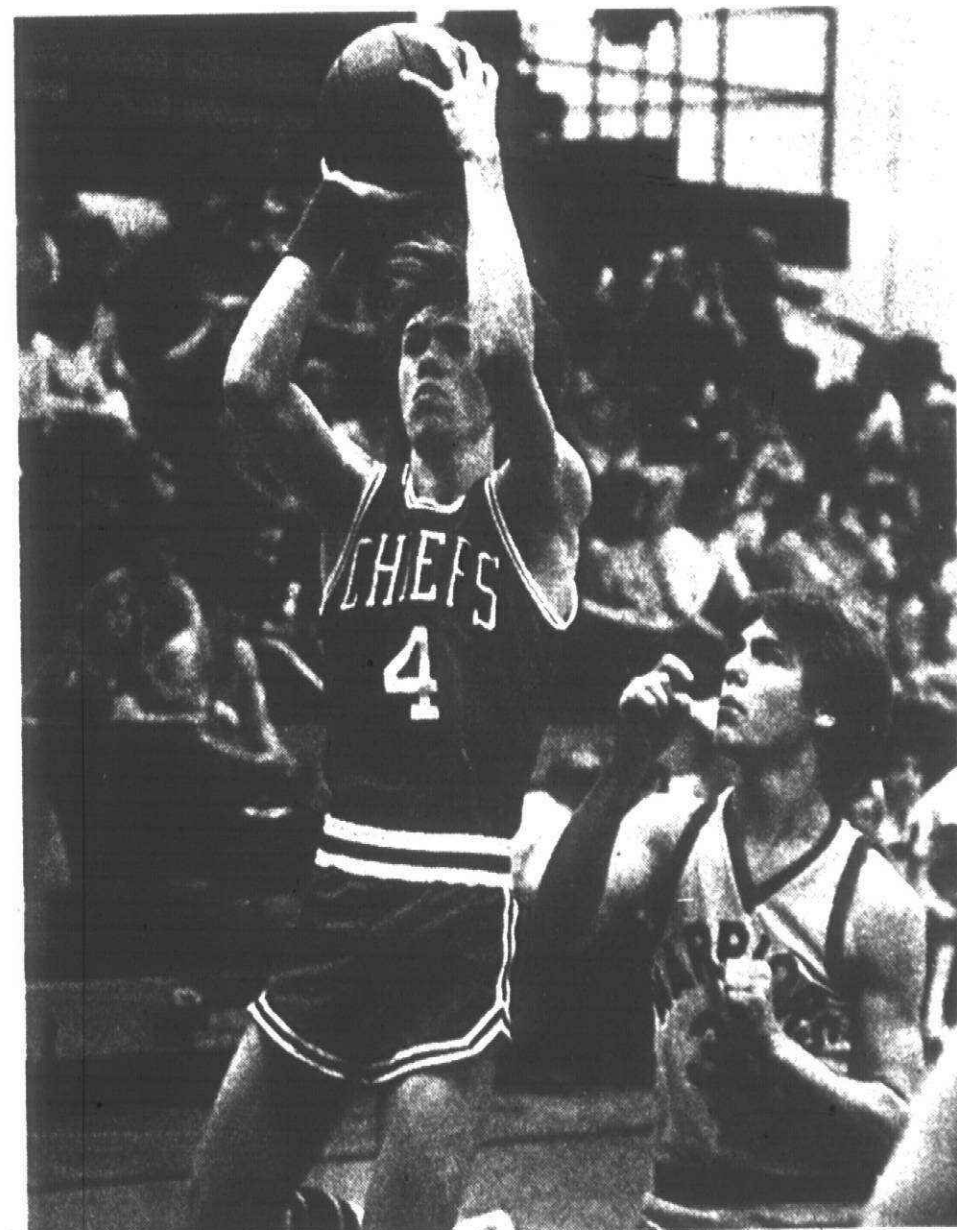

Jon McCarthy and Jeff Weber each netted 15 points for the Patriots. Jeff Wojcik added 13.

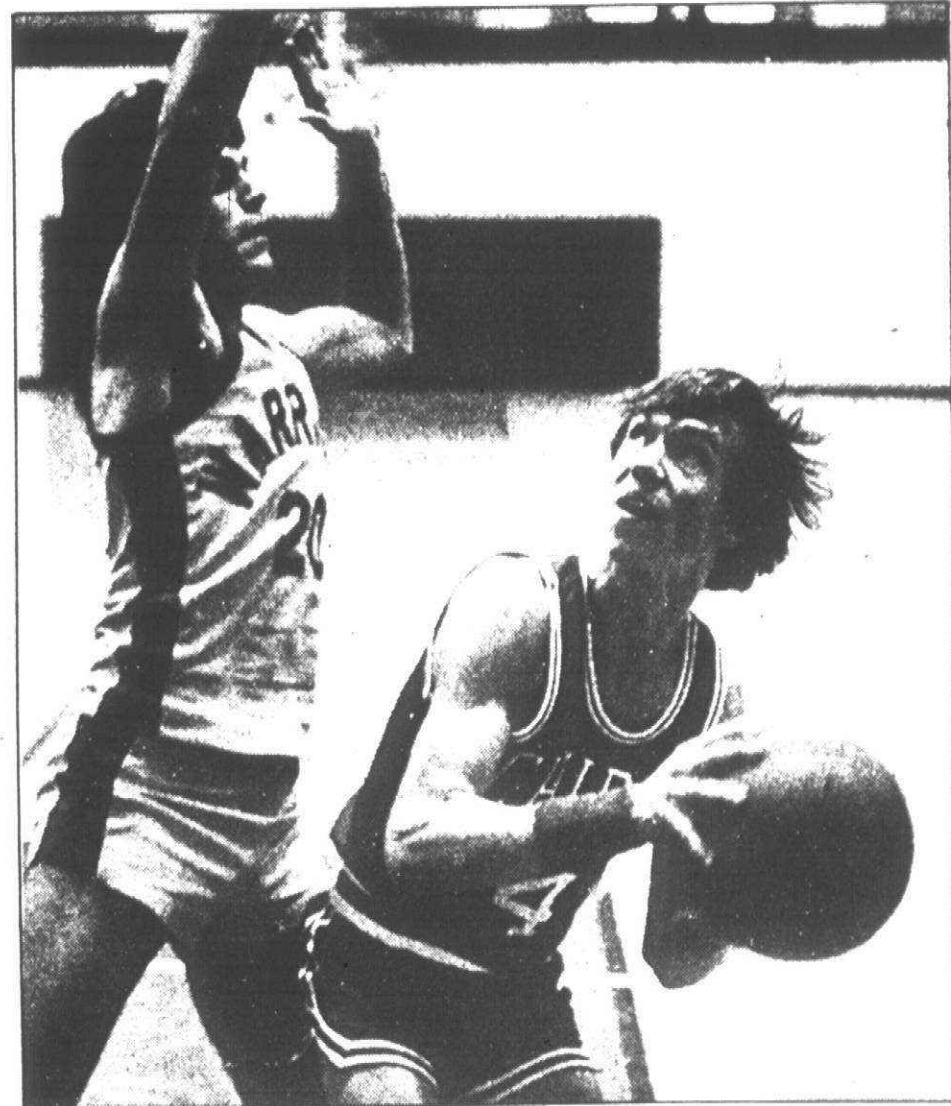

# Women make inroads on political scene

The smoke-filled room at the Hillside Inn also was filled with evidence that the campaign is going well.

The campaign concerning the coming presidential elections was discussed, of course. But also on the minds of about 100 women politicians and future politicians who attended was their own campaign to get more women elected to public office.

Members of the Second District Michigan Women's Political Caucus were told by keynote speaker Maryann Mahaffey that they had made "a great beginning."

"But I feel you are here because there is more to be done," said Mrs. Mahaffey, president pro tem of the Detroit Common Council.

Milling around the room was walking, breathing proof women are indeed making inroads into the formerly masculine bastion of politics. Judge Y. Gladys Barsamian was on hand. So were Rep. Mary Brown, (D-Kalamazoo), and a woman who aspires to be a state representative, Gail McKnight, now a member of the city council of Westland. Across the room sat Sylvia Skrel, the woman who could be her opponent in the race for the 36th district seat of former Rep. Bob Law.

The joint was jumping with women in public office. Lee Fidge, trustee of Plymouth Township; Mary Dumas, county commissioner; Sarah Power, regent of the University of Michigan; Nancie Blatt, trustee of Schoolcraft College; Alice Gundersen, first woman to be elected to the Livonia City Council in 25 years, and Mildred Jeffrey, chairman of the Wayne State University board of governors, were there.

The former mayor of Plymouth, Beverly McAninch also attended.

THE MAGNET called politics also drew several males. State Rep Tom Brown (D-Westland) was there, along with two aspiring male candidates, Bob Gwizdala and Bob Ficano. Both have their eyes on Law's seat in the state legislature.

In this room of wall-to-wall politics were a number of women, who are just getting their feet wet in political waters. Ellen Mika of Plymouth came to the event because she is thinking of getting involved in a political campaign. Joan McCotter of Livonia is ready to

get back in the political picture after raising her children.

Another Livonian, Val Pattison turned up because of the non-partisan nature of the women's political caucus. "I am neither Democrat nor Republican," she said. "I felt this is one group I would be comfortable joining. It's been exciting to be part of it and meet the type of people who are here tonight."

Eve Mouilso of Livonia was present and accounted for because last year she decided "it was time to have a woman on the Livonia City Council." She then became active in the Alice Gundersen campaign.

Also enjoying talk of caucuses, tax abatements and primaries was the president of the Livonia League of Women Voters, Jimmie Katz, along with several league members. Nearby was the co-chair of Michigan ERAmerica, Laura Callow.

READY WITH information on the Republican selection of delegates to the national convention was Ellen Templin of Bloomfield Township of the state Republican Committee. Rep. Brown spoke on Democratic caucuses and delegate selection.

The situation is complicated this year, especially for Democrats.

Mrs. Mahaffey told the group that women "have the unique responsibility to become involved in the political process to bring about change."

"We can sharpen our minds and pass on information to each other," she said. "We can be supportive of women running for office and share together our skills."

"It is heartening we are joining together so that women can come into their rightful place. I am talking about walking side by side with men, not ahead or behind. We should be concerned about quality in government and support women of quality."

THE SPEAKER suggested that women prepare resumes to be submitted to those who make governmental appointments.

"When I look at the boards and commissions at the state level, I am outraged," she declared. "They are so unbalanced as far as women are concerned. It's as though women didn't exist."

In her remarks about women in government, state Rep. Josephine Brown indicated that "more women are in the legislature than ever before, but we are hardly in danger of taking over the world."

"We are still not getting as many women in appointive positions as we should," Rep. Brown continued. "Not enough women are putting themselves forward. If a woman is appointed, more is expected of her than would be if her gender was different."

In her opinion, women would make excellent legislators because they "are

forced to deal with compromise in the home."

"Legislating is the art of compromise," she added. "Nobody gets everything they want."

MRS. MAHAFFEY observed that economics, not politics, is the top concern of most families. She announced that Mildred Jeffrey had come to the meeting wearing a button that summed up in two numbers a crucial family economic problem. On the button was written "59 cents."

"In spite of all our gains, women are still earning only 59 cents compared

with \$1 for men," she said. "This is of particular importance because 51 percent of women work, and about 75 percent of them are the sole support of their families."

In their remarks to the group both Rep. Brown and Mrs. Templin mentioned that delegates to both the Republican and Democratic conventions would be evenly divided between men and women.

Though this is a recent change for both parties, the minor revolution apparently was viewed as normal. It wasn't celebrated at all.

## How to vote in primary

Are you confused about how to participate in the state presidential primary? You are not alone.

Members of the Second District chapter of the Michigan Women's Political Caucus have the complicated word now following their recent session in Plymouth's Hillside Inn.

They learned Republicans will vote in the May 20 presidential primary election for presidential candidates and precinct delegates. On May 28 Republican precinct delegates will elect people to go to the GOP state convention of June 7.

That convention will pick delegates to the national convention in Detroit. The number of delegates for a particular candidate will be based on the percentage of vote in the May 20 primary.

DEMOCRATS will vote for their choices for president in district caucuses around the state at 11 a.m. April 26.

Democrats are boycotting the Michigan primary because it is "open" — that is, Republicans are able to cross over.

Shirley Grey, public information officer of the Michigan Democratic Party, explained how it will be done: "Candidates have been asked not to be in the primary because it will have no effect on delegates selection."

This means any delegates who come out of the state primary will not be seated at the national convention because their selection was in violation of party rules. So far President Carter and Sen. Edward Kennedy have indicated cooperation with the boycott.

IF YOU ARE interested in voting in the Democratic event, and are not yet a member of the Democratic party, you had better get busy. Membership is necessary to vote, and the deadline on becoming a member is Tuesday, Feb. 26.

At this late date, you may have to journey to the headquarters of the Michigan Democratic Party, 1300 E. Lafayette, Detroit, but you also might try calling the headquarters, 393-2944.

Filling out an official application blank is necessary, and party membership carries the paying of dues, unless there is financial hardship.

There are several places closer by that have these application blanks. Democratic applications can be mailed in if they are postmarked no later than midnight Feb. 26.

The Livonia Education Association, 15825 Middlebelt, Livonia, has on hand membership applications for both Republican and Democratic parties. Democrats can also pick up applications at Kennedy for President headquarters, 17000 Eight Mile in Southfield or Carter for President headquarters in suite 901 Northland Towers West, 15568 Northland Drive, Southfield.

Membership dues are \$10 for adults, \$2 for senior citizens and \$3 for students. Those who can't afford the dues don't have to pay.

THOSE WISHING to attend the Democratic district caucus of the Wayne County portion of the Second Congressional District will meet at Schoolcraft College. This meeting is for Democratic voters who live in Plymouth and Plymouth Township, most of Livonia and Northville and Northville Township.

The caucus for members of the 15th Congressional district will be held in the Democratic Club of Taylor, 23400 Wick. Residents of Westland, Garden City and Canton will vote in this caucus, along with residents of two precincts in southeast Livonia.

The district convention of the 17th Congressional District will be held in the student activities center of Mercy College, Outer Drive and Southfield Road. This district includes Redford, Farmington, Farmington Hills, Southfield, Lathrup Village and northwest Detroit.

Once Democrats are checked into the caucuses, they will divide up in groups according to which candidates they back. They will register their vote. Delegates and alternates to the national convention will be chosen immediately after the balloting.

The votes cast at the caucuses will be tallied and weighed in accordance with a formula approved by the state Democratic party. Selection of delegates will be based on the outcome of the vote.

The Democrats chose this controversial, complicated way of expressing their choice for a president because they believed large numbers of Republicans voted in their primary in 1972.

"The Democratic national party determined that it was very important for Democrats to select the Democratic nominee for president," explained state Rep. Mary Brown, D-Kalamazoo, to members of the women's political caucus. "People committed to the party should make its decisions."

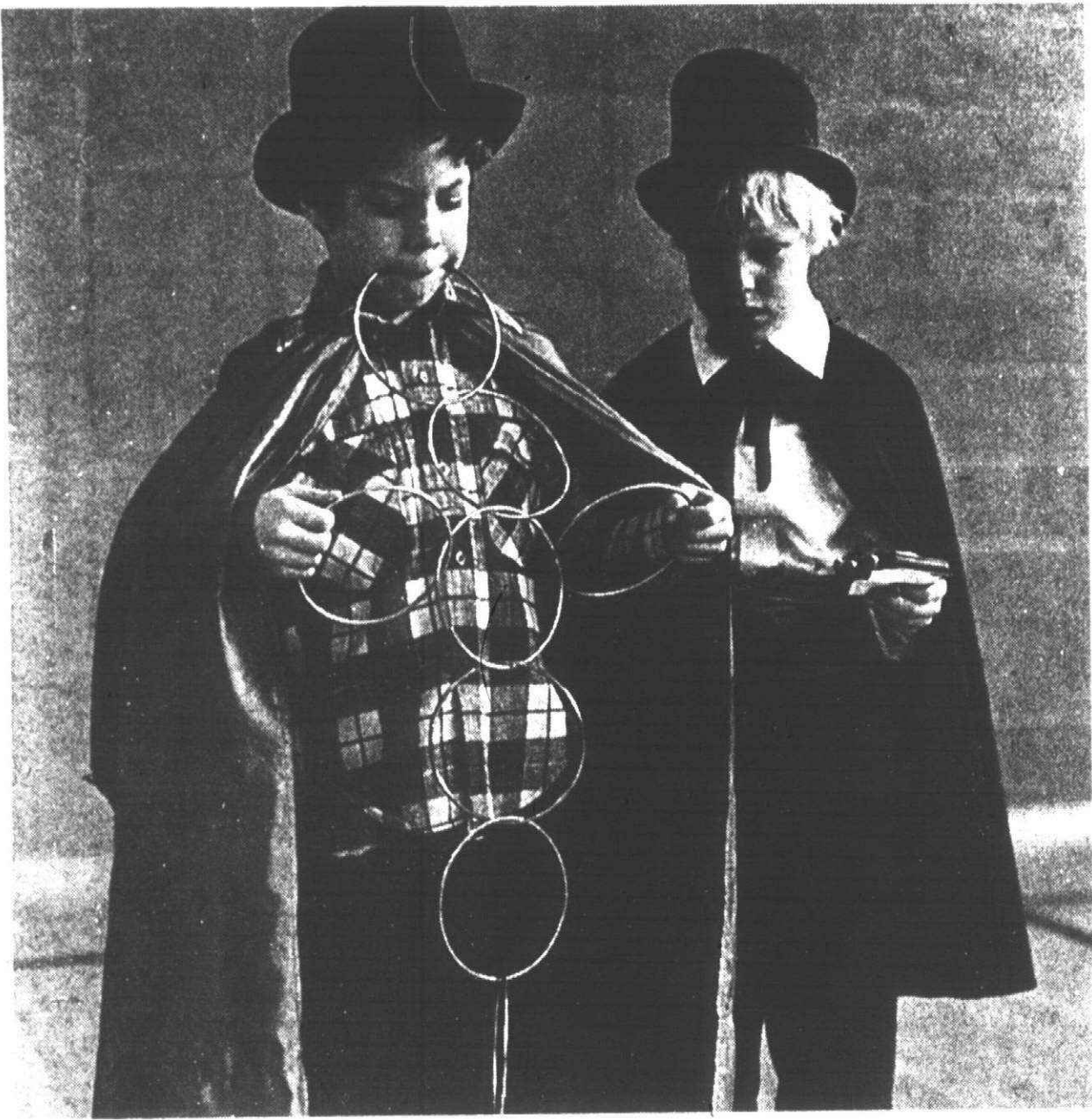


Maryann Mahaffey, president pro tem of the Detroit Common Council, told the women they still have a long way to go in politics.

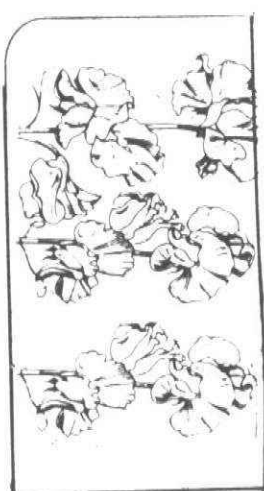

Combine flour, cocoa, baking soda and salt; add alternately with water and vanilla extract to egg mixture, beating at low speed until batter is smooth. Pour evenly into prepared pans. Bake at 375°F. 15 to 17 minutes, until top springs back when lightly touched in center. Immediately remove from pans and peel off wax paper; cool completely. Drain, slice and chill pears, reserving 1/4 cup syrup for Vanilla Custard. Prepare Vanilla Custard. To assemble torte, place one cake layer on serving plate. Arrange half of pear slices in sunburst design on cake layer. Spoon half the cooled custard evenly over pears; place second layer on custard. Spread remaining custard onto cake and decorate with remaining pear slices in sunburst design. Sprinkle with almonds. Chill several hours or overnight. Makes 10 to 12 servings.

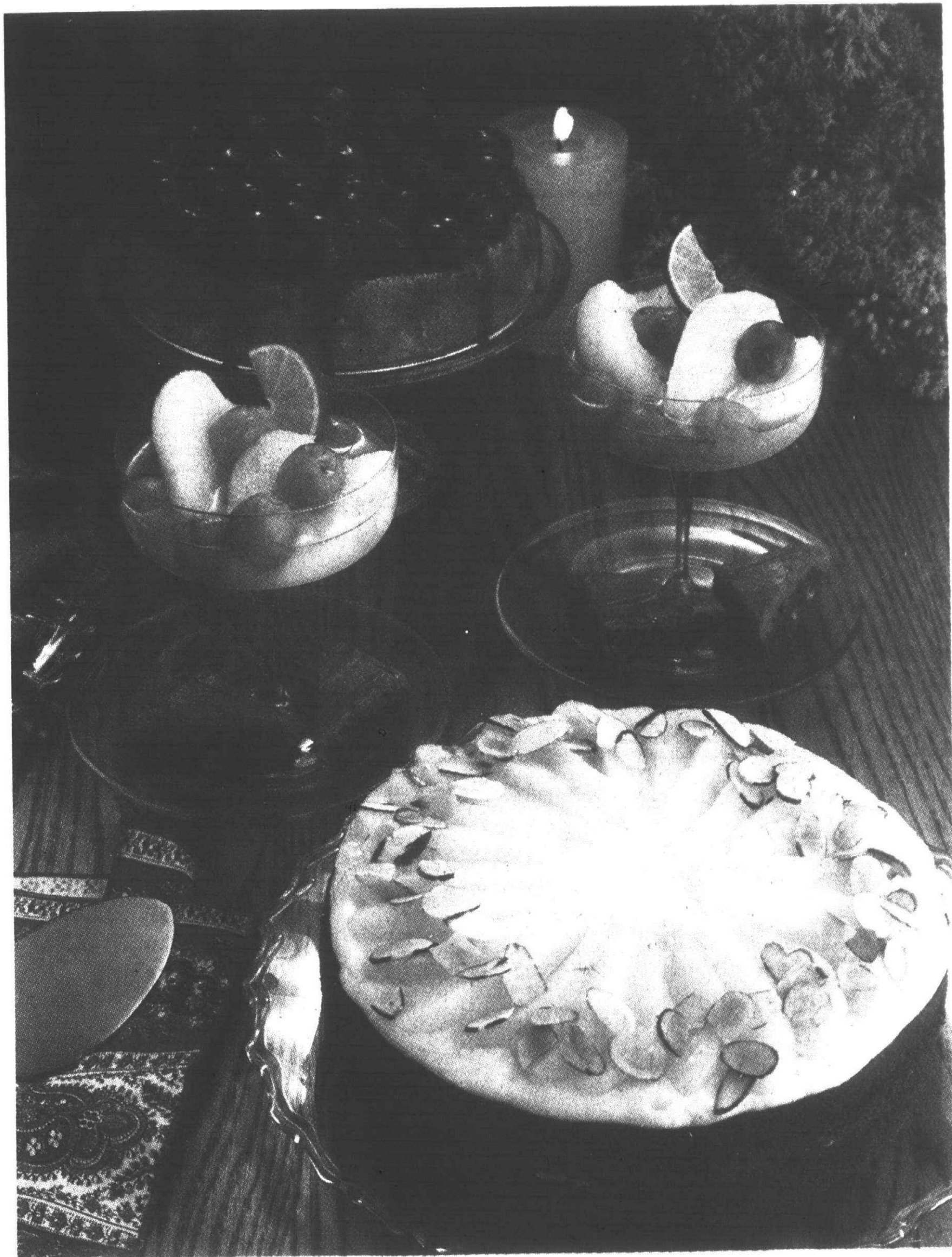

In blender container combine eggs, sugar, cocoa, vanilla extract and cream cheese. Cover and blend until very smooth. Pour mixture into bowl and stir in sour cream. Pour into prepared Vanilla Crumb Crust. Bake at 350°F. 45 to 50 minutes, or until edge is set and dull in color, while an area about 3-1/2 inches in diameter in center is still glossy. Cool thoroughly. Remove sides from pan. Top with Sweet Cherry Glaze. Chill several hours. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

**Vanilla Crumb Crust:** Combine 1 cup finely crushed vanilla wafer crumbs with 2 tablespoons sugar and 3 tablespoons melted butter or margarine. Press crumbs over bottom and 1-1/2 inches up sides of 8-inch springform pan.

**Sweet Cherry Glaze:** Drain 1 can or jar (17 oz.) dark sweet cherries, reserving syrup. Arrange cherries over top of cooled cheesecake. Combine 1 tablespoon cornstarch and 1 tablespoon lemon juice in saucepan. Gradually stir in reserved syrup. Cook and stir over medium heat until thickened and clear. Cool slightly. Spoon over cherries.

## The Warming Oven by Emily Watson

Seven days in Victoria, B.C. and at least a pound gained for each day.

For dinner the first night it was a beautiful freshly caught salmon. I don't know how much it weighed but it must have been almost two feet in length. It was baked to perfection and served with a wonderful tomato-base sauce. There was plenty left over for snacking and it was as delicious cold as it was in its original regal state.

Victoria has a host of fabulous restaurants and we visited several, enjoying the plump oysters, shrimp, clams and scallops. Dinner at an East Indian eating place simply whetted our appetites for more curry, more chutney. My hostess, Ila Marshall, took a batch of curried meatballs from her freezer and came up with another heavenly meal - Curried Meatballs served with rice, spiced peach chutney and a salad. She shared her recipes.

### CURRIED MEAT BALLS

Preheat oven to 500 degrees. Turn meat into a bowl and break up with a fork. Add and mix in bread crumbs, 1/4 cup milk, onion salt and ginger. Shape mixture into meat balls about 1/4-inch in diameter. Place in a single layer in a broad shallow baking dish. Bake in a pre-heated oven five to six minutes or until slightly browned. Drain and set aside.

Melt butter in a saucepan; saute onion and garlic until tender. Blend in flour, curry powder and salt. Gradually stir in two cups milk; add chicken bouillon cube. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until smoothly thickened and mixture comes to a boil. Add meatballs to sauce and heat through. Serve over rice with a spiced peach chutney.

### SPICED PEACH CHUTNEY (Makes about 1 1/2 cups)

Drain peaches reserving syrup. Coarsely chop fruit. Combine fruit, sugar, cinnamon sticks, cloves and nutmeg in a small saucepan. Simmer uncovered for 20 minutes stirring occasionally. Remove cinnamon sticks and cloves. Serve warm in a separate bowl.

(Ila used her own peaches which she freezes in quart-size milk cartons. She has an espaliered peach tree right outside her kitchen windows - she can open her window and pick a peach. She peels and slices the peaches, fills the carton to about one inch of the top. She makes a syrup of one cup of sugar to two cups of water. This is cooled and one teaspoon of ascorbic acid added for each cup of syrup. Pour cooled syrup to cover sliced fruit and staple top together before freezing. It takes about a cup and a half of syrup for each carton. These are the best frozen peaches I have ever tasted.)

## A Question of Taste

### Avocados for beauty

A very good friend recently treated herself to a professional facial. Knowing that I jog in the winter, she shared a piece of advice gleaned on her visit. Clients of the salon who engage in outdoor winter activities have always been warned to protect their faces with a generous layer of moisturizer when venturing out.

This advice has recently changed, however. A layer of moisturizer is insufficient. The face should be covered with a mask when spending any amount of time in the cold. Winter weather is just too harsh, too drying for the skin.

This set me thinking about foods which help keep the skin moist — from the inside. What came to mind immediately was avocados for two reasons. They are rich in natural oils (which accounts for their wonderful, buttery texture) and they are in peak supply in winter months.

Avocados, long-recognized for their skin-softening qualities, are a major ingredient in many moisturizing creams. The most effective moisturizing, however, takes place from the inside out so include the avocado in winter meals and enjoy its incomparable flavor as well as its skin-softening benefits.

These benefits derive not just from the oil in this fruit, but also from its high content of Vitamin C, which is essential for youthful skin.

I have always found it difficult to work rose hips into a meal plan, however, and would therefore suggest alternate sources of Vitamin C: tomatoes, peppers (sweet or hot), citrus fruits and of course, avocados. All are in abundant supply in the winter months, except for tomatoes. These should probably be purchased canned since the tomatoes available "fresh" at this time of the year are unspeakable.

The following dishes, by incorporating these rich sources of Vitamin C, provide delicious first-aid for winter-damaged skins.

**EGGS IN HOT SAUCE**  
2 tbsp. butter  
1 green pepper, diced  
1 medium onion, diced  
½ cup diced green chili pepper (or other hot peppers)  
6 medium tomatoes, diced  
Salt and freshly ground pepper  
6 ounces Monterey Jack cheese, shredded  
8 eggs  
1 medium avocado, peeled and sliced

Melt butter in 10- to 12-inch skillet. Add green pepper, onion and chili peppers; cook until softened. Stir in tomatoes, salt and pepper and cook until thickened, about 20 minutes, stirring often. Sprinkle cheese over sauce and allow to melt. Break eggs onto the melted cheese. Cover the skillet and cook 3 to 4 minutes, or until eggs are just set. Serve immediately, topped with avocado slices. Makes 4 servings.

This makes a superb brunch dish served atop crisp fried tortillas, or with flaky biscuits alongside. In either case, it should be accompanied by a pitcher of cold orange juice, especially for those who are unaccustomed to hot peppers.

The hot peppers should be handled with care. If you have a cut or other sore on your hands, let someone else handle the peppers or wear rubber gloves. Wash your hands immediately after handling the peppers, being careful not to touch your face (especially around the eyes) meanwhile.

**AVOCADO SALAD SANTE FE**  
2 ripe avocados, peeled and diced (The avocados

will probably be slightly underripe when purchased. Allow about two days at room temperature to ripen. This process can be hastened by enclosing the avocados in a paper bag.)  
2 large tomatoes, diced  
3 hard-cooked eggs, diced  
1 small onion, minced  
10 pimento-stuffed olives  
2 tsp. red wine vinegar  
1½ tsp. lemon juice  
¼ cup olive oil  
Salt and pepper to taste  
½ tsp. chili powder  
Lettuce leaves

Combine the avocados, tomatoes, eggs, onion and olives in a bowl. Combine the vinegar, lemon juice, olive oil, salt, pepper and chili powder in a jar. Shake well; pour over the avocado mixture and stir gently. Serve on the lettuce leaves. Serves 4.

**AVOCADO CITRUS BOWL**  
1 ripe avocado, peeled and sliced

1 large seedless orange, peeled and segmented  
1 grapefruit, peeled and segmented  
Combination of Romaine and curly endive lettuce leaves  
½ cup salad oil  
1 tbsp. tarragon vinegar  
Freshly ground black pepper  
1 tbsp. lemon juice  
Pinch of salt  
Pinch of dry mustard

Line a large platter with the lettuce leaves. Arrange alternating slices of avocado, orange and grapefruit sections over the lettuce. Combine remaining ingredients in a jar. Shake well. Pour over the salad and serve immediately. Makes about 6 servings.

There is a commercial on television these days that makes me hunger for oranges, which is, of course, what it is supposed to do. A very effective piece of film.

You have probably seen it. The commercial consists entirely of people breaking off and biting into orange segments — all done in slow motion so as to emphasize the juiciness of the orange, which makes it look like just the thing to shake a morning thirst, or better yet, a sitting-in-the-sun-getting-a-tan thirst.

For all of us who won't be going to sunny anywhere for tans this winter, it might help to prepare dishes that make us think of warmer climates — for instance, orange-flavored anything.

Any one of the following could shake off those psychological and real shivers. Let's pretend we're down south and enjoy these goodies.

#### SOUR CREAM ORANGE SLICES

4 oranges  
1 cup commercial sour cream  
2 sugar  
¼ tsp. cinnamon  
Wash and peel oranges; slice about ¼ inch thick and cut slices into thirds. Combine remaining ingredients. Serve orange slices, chilled, with sour cream dip.

#### ORANGE COOLER

2 10-ounce packages frozen strawberries (almost thawed)  
1 cup orange juice  
¼ cup lemon juice  
sugar to taste

Combine ingredients in blender. Place 2 cubes of ice in each 8-ounce glass. Pour in ½ cup of fruit mixture. Fill remainder with carbonated ginger ale or lime drink.  
Variation: Add 1 ounce of gin or vodka to each serving, and a dash of grenadine.

#### ORANGE BISCUITS

3 cups all-purpose flour  
3 tsp. baking powder  
½ tsp. soda  
1 tsp. salt



## Byrd's Kitchen

4 tbsp. butter  
1½ cups buttermilk  
1 tbsp. grated orange peel  
orange marmalade

Sift together the dry ingredients; work in the butter and then add the buttermilk to make soft dough. Stir in orange peel. Roll out thin and cut in rounds. Place two together and on the top biscuit, place a small spoonful of orange marmalade. Bake in 375-degree oven for 15 minutes, or until light brown.

#### BROILED FLOUNDER with ORANGE ALMOND SAUCE

3 lbs. of fillet of flounder  
¼ cup melted butter  
¼ tsp. salt  
¼ tsp. pepper

Place fish, skin side down, on preheated greased broiler pan. Season with salt and pepper. Brush generously with butter. Broil 2 inches under heat for 12 minutes, or until tender. Turn skin side up and broil just until skin becomes crisp. Serve with Orange Almond Sauce.

#### ORANGE ALMOND SAUCE

2 tbsp. butter  
2 tbsp. blanched almonds  
1½ tsp. brown sugar  
2 tsp. cornstarch  
1 cup orange juice

1½ tbsp. grated orange rind  
¼ tsp. powdered cloves  
½ tsp. seasoned salt

Melt butter in skillet. Saute almonds until golden brown. Remove almonds. In the same skillet, combine sugar, cornstarch, and orange juice. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until clear and thickened. Add rind, cloves, seasoned salt and almonds.

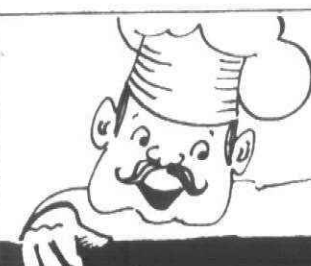

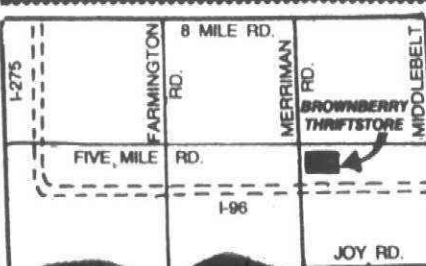

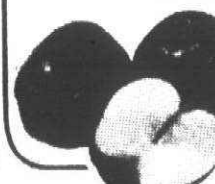

## Dull gardner wows the world in 'Being There'

Frequently, we finish reading an absorbing novel and anticipate encountering the characters again in a movie.

Jerzy Kosinski's short, provocative novel "Being There," although absorbing to read, would not seem to prompt such a reaction. Its dull humor and mocking story of a simple man's rise to prominence don't encompass the passion and adventure that are mainstays of many movies.

Its hero is as dull as can be — a retarded, middle-aged man who works as a gardener and spends all his free time watching television. That the producer, Andrew Braunsberg, recognized movie potential in this material is amazing.

Even more amazing is what the director, Hal Ashby, has wrought from Kosinski's own script. "Being There" (PG) captures the comic sensibility of the novel in one of the most disciplined, tightly controlled films ever produced.

PETER SELLERS is brilliant in his portrayal of Chance, the gardener. His calmness and restraint in developing this "underdeveloped" character demonstrate enormous acting skill and confidence. It would be so easy to succumb to temptations to broaden the comedy.

The circumstances provide ample material for elaboration into farce. Basically, the story interweaves two themes: a case of mistaken identity (the simple-minded person being mistaken for a wise man) and the effect of television on our culture.

In a cartoon that once appeared in The New Yorker, one person says to another: "Considering the potential of television to educate, aren't you glad it doesn't?"

"Being There" turns the joke around and shows the learning experience from television as a springboard into a society that relishes platitudes and mediocrity.

The mental deficient who makes this leap is Chance, the gardener. He wakes to his TV alarm and spends his days tending the Old Man's (his employer's) garden and watching television.

HE DOESN'T read or write. He has never left the Old Man's house, never ridden in an automobile. What little he knows, from shaking hands to doing yoga, he has learned by mimicking what he sees on the tube.

When the Old Man dies, Chance must leave. He is struck by a car, and the owner (Shirley MacLaine), the wife of a business tycoon and political kingmaker (Melvyn Douglas), takes him to her palatial home to recover.

Chance, dressed in the hand-tailored clothes of his late employer and reserved in manner, is accepted for what he appears to be — an important person. His occasional blunt remarks and laconic comments about gardening are interpreted as displays of refreshing candor and intelligent analogy.

His references to gardens are regarded as metaphors to economic swings — a fallow season followed by growth.

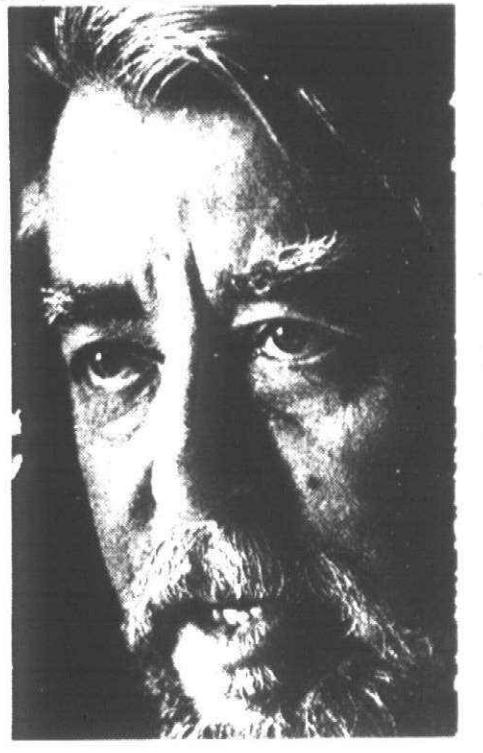
Thus the simple and innocent Chance becomes an economic authority and national celebrity. He communicates instantly with everyone because he speaks the language of Everyman, television.

The black humor of "Being There" is characterized, fittingly, by the black maid who raised Chance in the Old Man's house:

"Lawdy," she says, shocked to see the retarded gardener interviewed on a talk show, "don't that prove this is a white man's world?"

## Each day unfolds as a new adventure

There's a problem in talking to Fred and Dotie Simper about the life and times of a husband and wife team of artists.

"We've been married 30 years," she says.

Can't be, you say to yourself. She just said they love each other's work, like candlelight dinners for two, and often talk non-stop until the early hours of the morning. Does that sound like three decades of marriage? More like three days or, at best, three months.

But their meeting was romantic and they've been that way ever since — a mutual admiration society with a membership of two. They still prefer each other's company over anyone else's. Each is convinced the other is an extraordinary artist and both attribute a measure of their success to the other.

Simper said, "You should write a story about how Dotie brings the arts into every aspect of our lives."

She said, "We do live differently than most people — every day is an adventure."

When they have both spent long hours in their separate studios in their home nestled in the woodlands, he may suddenly receive a humorous written invitation from his wife for a late evening dinner by candlelight. They will both dress up. She may prepare an East Indian, Oriental or Mexican meal and use some artfully arranged accessories to create an appropriate atmosphere. All of this will be set up in a corner by a window overlooking a ravine.

"We never run out of talk," she said. "It's just glorious. We can start at the top and keep going."

Mrs. Simper, whose recipes and cooking skills have been the subject of a number of articles, said, "I can taste something and then go home and come up with my own recipe for it. My father was a good cook, his family, they were Swedes, were all good cooks."

But her eye and feeling for art, which made her a scholarship student at Detroit Arts and Crafts studying under the late Sarkis Sarkesian, is evident in the way she designs clothes, sews, paints, draws, cooks and designs homes.

SHE DID THE PLANS for their present home and has just completed a new set of building plans for the home which they intend to have built next year on the side of a mountain near Santa Cruz, Calif.

Mrs. Simper who paints in oil, but also likes to draw with pen, pencil and particularly charcoal said, "I'm kind of excited about doing those big ranges — the smash of those large areas."

The move west dovetails with the philosophy that has kept both of them

happy. She said, "We decided what we wanted out of life and painting was going to be uno. We would have done it over again."

She described her husband's career which was divided between working part-time as designer-artist at D'Arcy-MacManus & Masius Inc. advertising agency doing the Cadillac ads and working at home as a studio painter.

"It worked beautifully, it couldn't have been better," she said. "We figured the biggest thing in life is to have fun. Most people think having fun means you don't work, but it means being stimulated and excited. There should always be challenges."

Her flair for vivid, dramatic individuality and his soft-spoken, gentle ap-

proach make an intriguing combination for their careers as artists and their equally important roles as friends and marital partners.

"Our natures are different," she said. "We can arrive at the same conclusion from different points of view. We are both terrifically strong in our attitudes and ideas, yet we feed back to each other without even realizing it."

Simper recently retired from his position with D'Arcy MacManus & Masius, they are making preparations for resettling on the mountain in California. Soon, they will both be working as full-time studio artists.

It's the way of life they dreamed about when they met 30 years ago — the dream is still very much alive and about to be realized.

# Patterson pushes death penalty

"No law shall be enacted providing for the penalty of death."

— Michigan Constitution, Art. IV, Sec. 46.

"For every execution in the country, eight potential lives would be spared. That's not a bad trade-off."

— L. Brooks Patterson.

Patterson, prosecuting attorney of Oakland County, says the death penalty is needed because "the criminal justice system is a miserable failure."

"It does not deter crime," he told 100 members of the North Oakland Chamber of Commerce meeting in the Pontiac Silverdome last week. "It does not punish or rehabilitate the offender. It fails to protect the public."

PATTERSON'S OPPONENT in a debate on capital punishment opposes the death penalty under any circumstances.

"Justice demands punishment," said Howard Simon, state director of the American Civil Liberties Union. "What we're debating here is: Does justice demand execution?"

Patterson says it does. He's leading a petition drive to allow judges to levy the death penalty in Michigan as punishment for first-degree murder. He wants to put the issue on the November 1982 general election ballot.

Since the U.S. Supreme Court in 1976 gave states the option to bring back capital punishment, death penalty supporters have rallied. Since 1977, Utah, Florida and Nevada have executed one

man each.

In 1846, Michigan was the first English speaking jurisdiction to prohibit capital punishment. Nearly 40 states now have death penalty laws on the books.

"I DON'T SEE barbarians running around in 39 states," Patterson said.

"Some crimes are so bad that in some cases, it requires the taking of a criminal's life. That's not L. Brooks Patterson saying that. That's the United States Supreme Court."

But Simon, a former college criminal justice professor, argued that the nation's high court did not sanction capital punishment in the 1976 decision known as Gregg versus Georgia.

He said the court found the evidence "wholly inconclusive" that capital punishment is a deterrent to violent crime. "For a certain category," like hired contract killers, Simon said the court assumed capital punishment "may enter into the (murderer's) decision to act."

But for those who "act in passion," Simon said, the court assumed the death penalty would "have little effect."

"There's been no subject that's been studied more than this," added Simon.

"WHAT DID Detroit do to cut its homicide rate (from 801 in 1974 to the 400 range last year) in half?" Simon asked.

"Two hundred thousand people moved out, that's what they did," Patterson responded, which brought a roar of laughter from the assembled business people.

Both speakers cited a 1975 University of Chicago study on capital punishment's effect, but they differed on what Prof. Isaac Ehrlich's study concluded.

Simon found the study didn't imply that the death penalty proved a deterrent against crime. The study, said Simon, also said the "rate of murder and other crimes could be reduced by

an increase of employment and other opportunities."

"On balance," the prosecutor argued, the Ehrlich study said the death penalty does deter.

"Even if I couldn't convince him the deterrent is real, justice demands it (capital punishment)," Patterson said.

"The question is not deserving to be punished, per se," said Simon, "but if anything is gained for increasing punishment beyond mandatory life imprisonment."

Simon noted that capital punishment is opposed by Gov. William Milliken, Lt. Gov. James Brickley, Perry Johnson, state Department of Corrections head, and Wayne County Prosecutor William Cahalan.

## The Ishpeming connection to the Olympic competition

The Upper Peninsula of Michigan has a connection to the past and to the future of the Olympic Games, although few people see the connection when they are watching the games from Lake Placid.

The connection with the past is through the United States Ski Association (USSA), which officially sponsors the American Olympic ski team. USSA was born out of the National Ski Association, which in turn was born in Ishpeming, Mich.

The USSA celebrated its 75th anniversary in that city last summer at the National Ski Hall of Fame, which is also sponsored by USSA.

The Ishpeming Ski Club, which over the years has played an important part in both USSA and the Hall of Fame, holds its annual ski jumping tournament at Suicide Hill in Ishpeming March 1 and 2.

The Hall of Fame is known among its fans as an exhibit hall for the history of skiing around the world, but it is now earning a new reputation as the home of a seedling research center. The National Ski Library is trying to amass the largest collection in the world of books and films on skiing.

Research materials may not leave the library, but researchers can use the materials and the facilities of the hall.

That's the connection to the past. The connection to the future is taking place down the road in Marquette, where a group of people want the city to be named an official Olympic training site.

A PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT committee has been at work for two years preparing their arguments for a year-round training site in Marquette County. Dr. Roy Heath of Northern Michigan University has been a central figure in the planning.

The committee believes that very few regions in the United States have the terrain, the snowfall required for winter sports, the lakes and the sports facilities found at NMU, at Suicide Hill and in the surrounding countryside, within a 1-3 mile radius.

Dr. Heath and Bertram Boyum of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. have already attended several meetings at which the proposed training site was discussed. They have heavy competition, including an application from Kalamazoo for the same training site.

A decision is expected to be made soon after the Winter Olympics are over and people in the Olympics business have the time and energy to get back to such questions.

Meanwhile, Michigan travelers can take advantage of the Ski Hall of Fame, Suicide Hill and the facilities that are available in the Marquette and Ishpeming area.

# Mass preservation is going on today along the blue bayous

If you take the high road and I take the low road from New Orleans to Lafayette, you'll get there before me but I'll have more fun.

The high road is a fast expressway that crosses the Mississippi River at Baton Rouge and goes straight west in four-lane splendor into Cajun country.

The low road is Highway 90, a two-lane that makes a red curved line on the map from New Orleans through the swamp country near the Gulf of Mexico and then northwest to Lafayette.

Along this trail, 20th century Cajuns are rebuilding the sugar plantations, colonnaded houses and old Acadian villages that grow out of their 18th and 19th century heritage. Part of the reason is clear in Morgan City, where offshore oil rigs make a skyline in the local shipyards.

Oil has brought new money to southern Louisiana. The Cajuns are using some of it to restore reminders of old money in this sugar plantation country.

THE CAJUNS, or French Acadians, have been here a long time, ever since the first refugees from Nova Scotia, in what is now Canada, arrived here in the 18th century. Surprisingly, a bus or car drive through this country will give you the feeling you discovered at it before the main run of tour buses got here.

Highway 90 is the Old Spanish Trail, now a divided highway thru through country and cypress forests. This is good hunting country for everything from waterfowl to woodchucks, armadillos and raccoons.

Stops should include the old plantations of Thibodaux, the oil rigs and swamp gardens of Morgan City, the mansions of Franklin and New Iberia, and the legendary reminders of Longfellow's Evangeline, before you get to

Lafayette, called the capital city of Cajun country.

The Raceland Sugar Mill, the largest in Louisiana, is your landmark for the brief detour into Thibodaux and the Bayou Lafourche. Bayou Lafourche is called the longest main street in the world, because it runs through villages from Donaldson to the Gulf of Mexico and was once a major outlet of the Mississippi.

THIBODAUX HAS three main points of interest. You can view, but usually not tour, old plantation houses that are still occupied by families, including the Acadia Plantation where Jim Bowie built cottages in the 1820s, and the Acadia Rienzi Plantation, said to have been built as a retreat for Queen Maria Luisa of Spain in 1796.

If you are lucky enough to be in Thibodaux during the firefighters' fair, you will see all 500 firefighters of the biggest volunteer fire department in the world. Residents recommend you don't have a fire that day unless you can put it out with mugs of beer.

The town's most famous point of interest may someday be the Laurel Valley Plantation, now open to visitors by appointment but still a long way from being fully restored.

LAUREL VALLEY looks now like a gently dilapidated leftover sugar plantation from "Gone With the Wind," but there is no big plantation house and the brick sugar mill has collapsed. It wasn't always so.

Marie Louise Lepine, who came to Thibodaux from Louisiana State University during the Sugar Depression of 1927, remembers it otherwise.

"When I first came to this plantation as a bride, all the buildings were painted white, with white fences around them," she said. Someday, if the money can be raised, the plantation will be restored for posterity.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Lepine and her family, who still farm 600 acres, will give tours to anyone who stops at the plantation office. They would prefer you call first: 447-7352. They won't ask for, but they will definitely appreciate, a donation to the foundation which is restoring this plantation.

Laurel Valley represents old money. It once took 100 families to keep the plantation's operations running. A few miles down the road in Morgan City, you'll see new money in the shipyards that built the first oil rigs to float on the gulf.

Most tourists are surprised to learn that floating oil rigs make a natural fish home, and that fishermen love to tie up to the floating rigs for a day at the reel.

Morgan City, on the Intercoastal Waterway in the Atchafalaya River Basin, has had a municipal auditorium as the center of its social life for 17 years. A few feet away is a 3½-acre park called the Swamp Garden. I have never seen a museum park quite like it.

INSIDE THE GATE, a stump is carved with the words, the Story of the Great Swamp. There are not many of the original 600-year-old cypresses left, even here, but they have saved a genuine swamp full of cypress, cypress knees, and hanging vines. Real alligators sleep in the water and mannequins

show how people lived, fished and boated in this setting.

It was in this swamp country that the first movie of Edgar Rice Burroughs' Tarzan was filmed. Tarzan is represented in the trees, along with his famous yell recorded.

The Brownell Memorial Park and Carillon Tower, with its view of Lake Palourde, is also worth a visit in Morgan City.

One of the most interesting lessons for a first-timer in this area is that a swamp or a cypress lake is nothing like the steaming jungle setting so often shown in old movies.

## Try the local bubbly when touring Europe

If it's true that the best things in life are free, a judicious bit of planning can make this adage work in Europe.

In the course of itineraries that include castles, churches and chateaux, one can vary the aesthetics of sightseeing with a free drink of the local wine or liquor.

Virtually every country in Western Europe affords tasting opportunities.

### CHAMPAGNE

Reims, Epernay and Ay all lie within easy driving range of Paris, and the region teams with wine cellars.

Bottlers take pride in their establishments, and visitors are offered a short course in history, art and antiquity along with ample supplies of bubbly.

The Mercier cellars, cut into chalky limestone, are so large that Champagne aficionados travel through the storage vaults on a narrow gauge railroad.

Pomery & Greno galleries are decorated with bas-reliefs chiseled into the overhead stone.

A number of cellars were once Roman quarries, dug out by the ancients in thoughtful anticipation of future needs.

### BORDEAUX

In major centers, such as Beaune in Burgundy or Colmar in Alsace, you will find the headquarters of the comite' interprofessionnels (regional groupings representing both growers and shippers).

Any comite' can point you to a place where you learn something about wine and get a complimentary glass or two.

In Bordeaux, the largest of France's

wine-growing areas, the C.I.V.B. (Comite' Inter-professionnel du Vin de Bordeaux) is at 1 Cours de 30 Juillet, near the Opera House.

### COGNAC

Take the train from Paris' Gare d'Austerlitz and head for the peaceful farming town of Angouleme.

Drive a short distance to Cognac and the 200-year-old Hennessy distillery.

A brief tour through this institution is topped off by a stop in the paradise room. There, one is offered a broad selection of the local tipple, "distilled," a poet once said, "from the dawn's rays."

### CHARTREUSE

For another kind of strong potable, visit Voiron in the Carthusian Mountains in southeastern France and travel to the distillery which is 18 miles from the village.

The monk's famed liqueur is a secret blend containing 130 herbs and comes in yellow or green.

The formulas are carefully guarded by three monks whose order has taken vows of silence and poverty.

One of their number is permitted to break the silence barrier, although his sentences are brief.

The resident monks are bountiful hosts, serving up an elixir ve'ge'tal, a powerful potion of brandy and honey, to all comers.

### SHERRY

Another sampling target is somewhat off the beaten track near Cadiz in the south of Spain.

Here is the Sherry triangle formed by the towns of Jerez de la Frontera, Puerto de Santa Maria and Sanlucar de Barrameda.

For the uninitiated, Sherry is produced in above-ground structures called bodegas, with high vaulted ceilings and open windows.

Described somewhat poetically as cathedrals of wine, they are cool and dim, filled with rows of casks from which the unique solera system by which Sherry is bottled.

Stop off at Gonzales, Byass & Co., Ltd.; visit John Harvey & Sons, where you can sip from a solera that may contain a drop or two of 400-year-old wine.

# Clean that interior

Strange as it may seem, the condition of the interior of a car is more important than the exterior to get top dollar at trade-in time, says the Automotive Information Council.

It cites two basic reasons:  
1. The auto dealer can fix exterior dings and scratches easily, and even refurbish the paint, but a stained, abused interior usually cannot be cleaned properly.

2. A carelessly kept interior signals that the car owner has neglected proper mechanical maintenance.

"A used-car specialist can look at the interior of a car and give you a good idea of the character of the owner," said Sam Lafata, president of Aptco Auto Auction of Taylor, one of the nation's largest car brokerage firms.

"When we see a car which has filthy carpeting, soft-drink stains on the upholstery, a ripped headliner (ceiling) and things like that, we just know

that he hasn't taken care of the vital parts of the car, such as the brakes, transmission, etc. and the car probably is badly in need of a tune-up.

"Used-car appraisers generally follow the motto: If it's clean inside, buy it."

He urges car owners to vacuum the upholstery and carpeting every few weeks to keep the dirt from getting ground into the fibers. He also recommends floor mats and suggests that spills be wiped up immediately.

Vinyl and leather interiors also should be cleaned and waxed with the type of product specified in the owner's manual.

"Shiny seats... we like that," Lafata said. The car's windows should be left open occasionally to air it out and therefore get rid of lingering odors such as cigarette smoke.

Experience shows that a cared-for car can bring hundreds of dollars more than a neglected vehicle at trade-in time, according to the AIC.

## Truck pull comes to Silverdome

Four-wheel-drive truck pulling returns to the Pontiac Silverdome for the third consecutive year Saturday and Sunday, March 1-2.
