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## Treasurer's job goes full-time

The position of Canton treasurer has been boosted into a full-time job effective Nov. 20, 1980.

The Township Board changed the part-time status of the position by a 5-1 vote Tuesday night in hopes that a full-time treasurer will improve organization and procedures into the department.

Candidates will vie for the job in the

## Elected officials get raise

Salaries of Canton's elected clerk and treasurer were raised 25 percent Tuesday night with another wage increase slated for December.

The salary of the treasurer, who will work full-time after next November's election, was placed in the same bracket as the clerk's.

The treasurer currently earns \$7,500 a year for the 20-hour position. He or she will earn \$27,500 — the same as the clerk — when the new Canton board takes office Nov. 20.

A scheduled increase on Dec. 1 will increase the salary of the clerk and treasurer to \$30,000 a year.

The township clerk currently earns \$22,000.

The salary of the supervisor, who

August primary and the general election in November.

Maria Falkiewicz, the township's acting deputy treasurer, requested the change in the position. She maintains that the treasurer's department is "in really bad shape" because of poor organization and staffing.

Mrs. Falkiewicz resigned from the deputy treasurer post last month because of her frustrations with the department. She has continued to work on a temporary basis, however, because of the illness of Treasurer Jim Donahue.

Donahue has been absent from the last two township board meetings and did not participate in Tuesday's vote to increase the treasurer's hours. He has indicated in the past that he would be unable to run as a candidate for a full-time treasurer's position because of the demands of his job with a family-owned florist business.

TRUSTEE STEVE Larson was the only board member who voted against making the treasurer's position full-time.

Mrs. Falkiewicz maintains that the treasurer's department needs a full-time supervisor to make organizational changes. The department is the only one in township hall which lacks a full-time department head.

Although Mrs. Falkiewicz has often worked 40 or 50 hours a week, her salary of \$135 per week covers only 20 hours.

The township board recognized the need to increase the hours of supervisory personnel in the department. However, there was some debate on the effectiveness of a full-time elected official.

## Could farm zoning fail? Trustees say perhaps

Their fears of adopting the farmland preservation section of Canton's proposed zoning ordinance were never publicly emphasized before.

But some members of the Canton board admit that concerns over possible litigation could stall board approval of the farm program's first step until development right monies are obtained.

The admission comes on the eve of considering a new zoning ordinance which places some 5,000 acres west of Canton Center in an agricultural-industrial (AGI) zoning district.

Land in that classification could not be divided into parcels smaller than 40 acres. The land could not be developed or used for any purpose except farm-related activities.

Until now, the board has publicly supported the position of the planning commission to adopt the zoning ordinance and farm classifications by the end of March.

Approval this month would allow the Canton Tax Board of Review to lower property assessments in the western half of the township.

Publicly, the board has indicated that it would approve the zoning ordinance and worry about obtaining development rights funds at a later date.

They maintained that western Canton cannot be developed for years because of the absence of water and sewer facilities.

Trustee Eugene Daley is the only board member who has publicly opposed the farmland preservation plan.

BUT NOW, at least four board members — Supervisor Noel Culbert, Clerk John Flodin, Daley and Trustee Ste-

phen Larson — admit reservations about approving the ordinance without development right monies in hand.

Culbert has proposed zoning all agricultural lands in western Canton for 2½-acre homesites until money is obtained to reimburse landowners for their lost development rights.

Trustee Carol Bodenmiller, an advocate of adopting the agricultural-industrial zoning now, said she was "scared to death" when she received Culbert's proposal through the mail last week-end.

She called a press conference Monday morning to publicize her fears that the zoning ordinance in its present form will fail.

The board is scheduled to consider the ordinance at a special meeting March 13.

Mrs. Bodenmiller serves as the township board's representative on the planning commission — the body which has been working on the zoning ordinance proposal since 1975.

Board members' concern over the lack of development right monies were not expressed at joint meetings with the planning commission last month, she said.

The township board has shelved proposals of resident Gary Roberts and some planning commissioners to place a development rights millage question on the ballot this year.

On Jan. 29, Supervisor Noel Culbert proposed allocating only \$10,000 of an expected \$480,000 in state revenue-sharing funds to a development rights account.

In 1978 the cost of development rights was estimated at \$16 million.

"I don't know what they were thinking of," Mrs. Bodenmiller said of the board. "Now, all of a sudden, it's, 'Oh,

"we don't have the money for development rights."

CULBERT CLAIMS adoption of the agricultural-industrial zoning without a working development rights plan "would make a lot of attorneys rich."

"We could jeopardize the financial resources of this township for decades," he said. "I feel it's grossly unfair to zone a man's land for 40 acres and not give him any money for development rights."

Culbert said he will present an ultimatum to the board March 13.

He will ask board members to allo-

cate at least \$250,000 to a development rights account during each of the next five years. The money would come from state revenue-sharing funds which are expected to total \$1.3 million in 1981.

If board members approve the proposal and commit to a development rights account, Culbert said he will vote in favor of the agricultural-industrial zoning district.

If the proposal is denied, the supervisor said he will push for 2½-acre home sites (AGR) throughout western Canton.

Culbert views the AGR classification

as a "holding district" which could be changed when a development rights program is implemented. Part of western Canton is zoned AGR under the present zoning ordinance proposal.

"The board is in a position where they're trying to implement a program they don't have the money for," Culbert said. "If the board decides to decide — which may be very difficult — then it's time to put the hands on the table."

"If the township board has the guts to put money where its mouth is, then I'll vote for AGI. If not, then I'll vote for the entire western half to be zoned AGR."

MRS. BODENMILLER is joined by Trustee Robert Greenstein in criticism of Culbert's AGR proposal.

Landowners would not receive the tax break allowed by the AGI zoning

classification, they said. They would be ineligible for development right payments until the zoning of their land is changed to AGI.

"You'd be taking the farmers' taxes and bankrupting him," said Greenstein, the township's farmland preservation director.

"It won't work and it can't work. The fact that we don't have development rights money is not a killer of this plan because western Canton can't be developed for another 10 years anyway."

"This is another example of a person with a third-grade mentality trying to run this township," Greenstein said in criticism of the supervisor.

"What's he's done throughout his tenure is come up with ill-thought ideas."

Greenstein said he will vote in favor of the zoning ordinance after insisting

### At LWV forum

## Bond proposals explained

Disagreement over which alternatives are best to handle a growing student population in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools may still exist among members of the school board.

But the board presented a united front Monday night as members answered audience questions at an informational forum sponsored by the Northville, Plymouth, Canton, Novi League of Women Voters.

The forum's purpose was to explore the three ballot proposals that will be presented to district voters in a March 27 special election.

PROPOSITION I asks for approval to issue bonds to raise \$14,623,000 for the purposes of building renovation, especially of Central Middle School; portable classrooms, school bus purchases; air conditioning for schools going to an extended school year calendar; equipment replacement; an energy conservation system; and improved maintenance.

Proposition II asks for approval to issue bonds for \$7,277,000 to build a 40-classroom annex at Centennial Education Park and to remodel Central Middle School for use as a high school facility.

Approval of the \$21.9 million request would allow the board to levy debt retirement millage. The owner of a \$60,000 home would pay about \$89.10 in additional taxes next year.

If both proposals pass, the district's grade structure will stay at K-5, 6-8 and 9-12.

If only Proposition I passes, the structure will change to K-6, 7-9, 10-12.

The third proposition asks voters for .5 mill (50 cents per \$1,000 state equalized valuation of property) to be used only for maintenance and repairs.

The exact cost to taxpayers of any of the proposals is dependent on the SEV, a figure not yet established for the coming year. According to Raymond Hoedel, the district is basing projected costs on a SEV figure of \$740 million.

AUDIENCE QUESTIONS, which

were written down and then screened for duplication and objectivity by LWV members, focused on concern about grade re-alignment and subsequent boundary changes, which schools would convert to the ESY calendar; actual cost of the proposals; and whether the high price tag of renovating Central is justified.

Some answers were forthcoming.

Board member Flossie Tonda said boundary changes were inevitable, no matter what the outcome of the election.

Superintendent John Hoben told the audience "it is safe to speculate that all but Starkweather, Tanger and Geer elementary schools will go ESY within the next three or four years."

The reason those three schools would not go ESY, he said, is because their age or size would make it impractical to air-condition them for year-round use.

He said Lowell school in Livonia, which the Plymouth-Canton district plans to rent, would not be air-conditioned.

ized the mother to the symptoms," said Dr. Polkowski. "The child was recovering from the chicken pox and she (the mother) calmly made the connection, which was excellent. So she checked with her doctor."

"Parents need to be informed instead of panicked," she continued. "There has almost been an overreaction (to Reye's). We need to avoid a panic situation by providing information for parents to check with their physician."

Symptoms include vomiting, a behavior change, disorientation, hostility and finally a coma.

"This (Reye's) isn't a common condition, but it does occur after some types of viral infections. We don't know why," Dr. Polkowski explained.

THE WORST NOW may be over for parents of Walker School students, who reported 28 to 30 cases of scarlet fever

within the last three weeks. Walker School, at 39932 Michigan Avenue in Canton Township, includes students from Wayne and Canton.

"We've definitely leveled off now and the same is true with viruses," reported Sandy Walker, head of the Wayne-Westland district's health services division.

Mrs. Walker said that parents of students in the Walker School area were notified about the "higher than usual" number of cases of the bacterial infection.

"It's not an epidemic," stressed Mrs. Walker. "It is a communicable condition. I'm glad the weekend is here. That should help a lot. I just wish it was longer."

She added that parents in the Walker area have been told to watch for such symptoms as a rash, red tongue, fever

## Tornado spotting is course focus

Destruction resulting from a violent tornado cannot be prevented. However, with early warning, potential deaths and injuries to people in the path of a tornado can be prevented.

As part of the Plymouth area EACT team's continuing education service to this community, the team will present its first Tornado Safety Training class of this season at 8 p.m. March 8 at the All Saints Lutheran Church at the corner of Newburgh and Joy roads in Livonia.

The program, run in conjunction with the National Weather Service, is open to the public at no charge. This is the second year the program is offered. Last year some 15 classes were held. According to Charles VanVleck, the team's president and commander, the public will be taught how to properly react to a tornado warning as well as a tornado watch. Also, representative of the weather bureau will instruct those interested in how to report a tornado and funnel cloud formation.

The team also is interested in training spotters. In cooperation with the weather service, the team has trained several weather spotters and sent them out to preassigned spotting posts whenever a tornado watch is posted in this area.

The team has been covering a life along Napier Road between Ten Mile and Ford roads for three years. The team also monitors CB channel nine every weekend, on holidays, and during the week from 3-6 p.m. Their base is at the Plymouth Hilton.

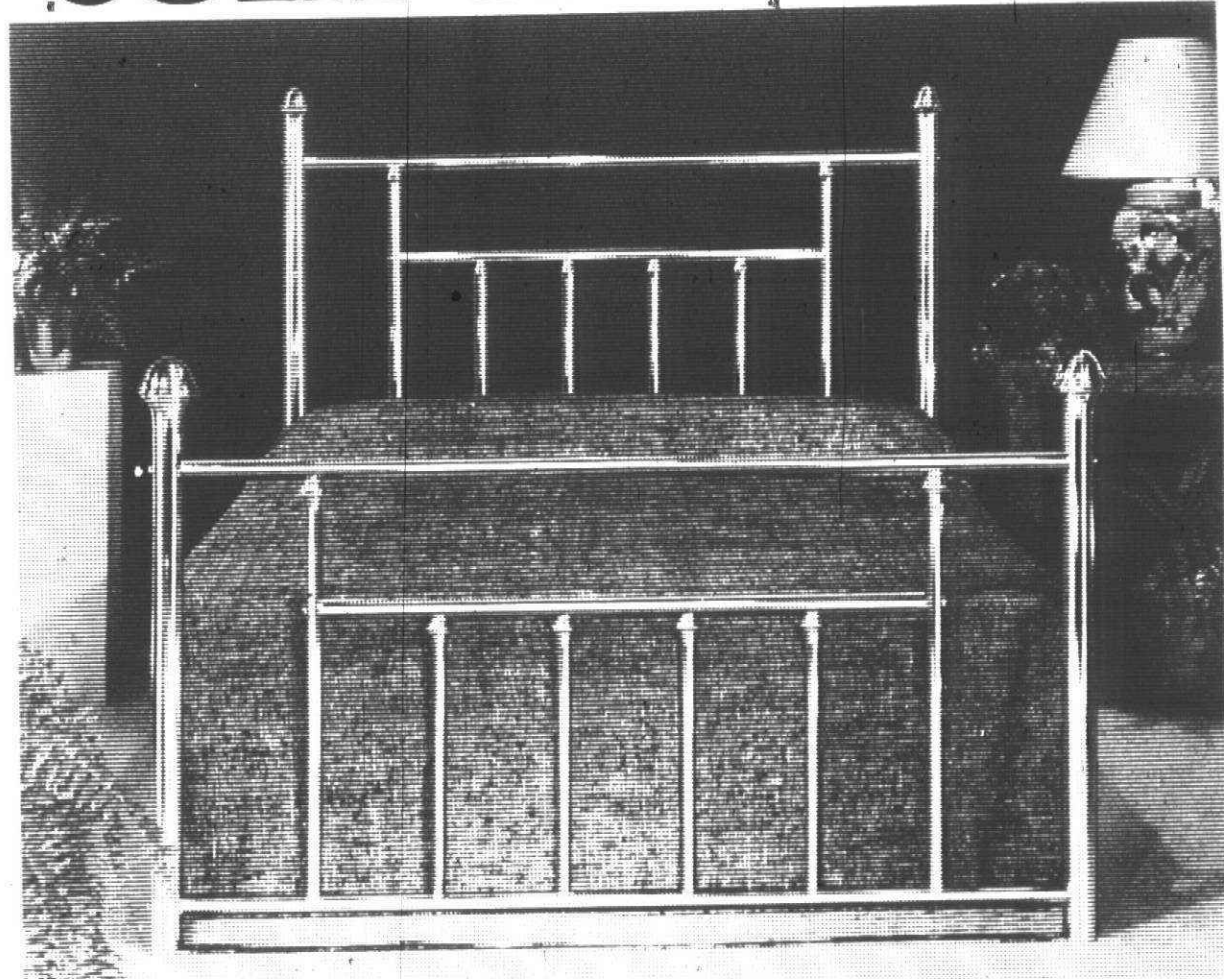
According to VanVleck, this is tornado season. In Michigan some 7,000 reported tornadoes have been spotted since 1950.

Citing National Weather Service statistics, he said the general public has spotted about 10 tornadoes in the past three years as compared to one on radar by the weather service.

"We're looking to train more spotters as part of our job in REACT," he said.

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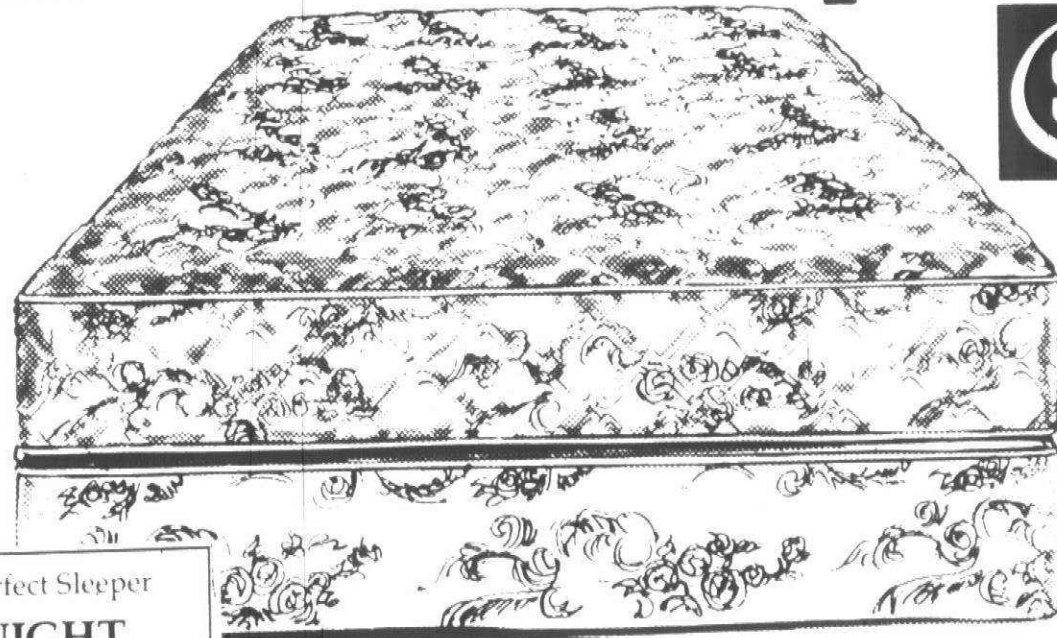
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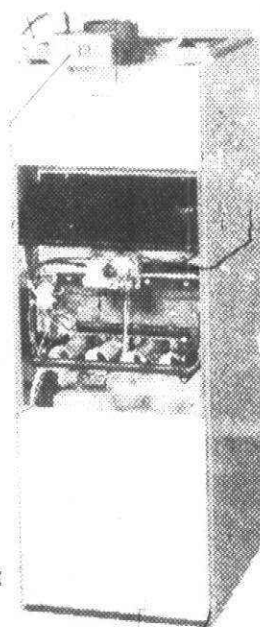
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Strikers man the picket lines Monday after bargaining broke down the day before. (Staff photos by Gary Caskey)

## Burroughs is hit by strike

As of early this week, there were no plans for reconvening bargaining sessions between Burrough's Corp. officials and representatives of Local 1313 of the United Auto Workers.

At midnight last Friday some 1,700-1,800 members of that union walked off their jobs from three Detroit area Burrough's assembly plants when their former three-year contract expired.

The majority of those workers, some 1,000, are based at the Plymouth Township Burrough's plant on Plymouth Road. The others work out of the Wayne and Detroit-Tireman plants.

According to Local Vice President Dock Duncan, negotiations broke off on Sunday after a month of serious bargaining when it was determined "no progress had been made."

He said they first met to iron out a new three-year contract in mid-December.

He added both sides are available for bargaining when one or the other decides to meet. Although a state and federal arbitrators have been appointed to the talks, neither one has been active in the negotiations as yet.

According to the union, "the two big issues" in bargaining this year are cost of living and a revised pension plan for retired and regular employees.

According to Duncan, the company is attempting to put a cap on proposed cost-of-living allowance in the new contract.

PRESENTLY, under the old contract, there is no ceiling on the cost of

living factor. According to Burrough's spokesperson Neal Jackson, the Plymouth plant is responsible for final assembly of small scale computer systems and computer parts.

He said the plants were still operating with the help of supervisors and maintenance personnel.

Union members say otherwise, however.

"As far as I know, the work has been stopped," said Duncan.

"Their operation has been shut down," said John Allen, a picket captain in Plymouth. "There's been no fabrication and no assembly."

According to Reggie Watts, a local trustee, there's been no violence at the Plymouth plant since the strike took effect.

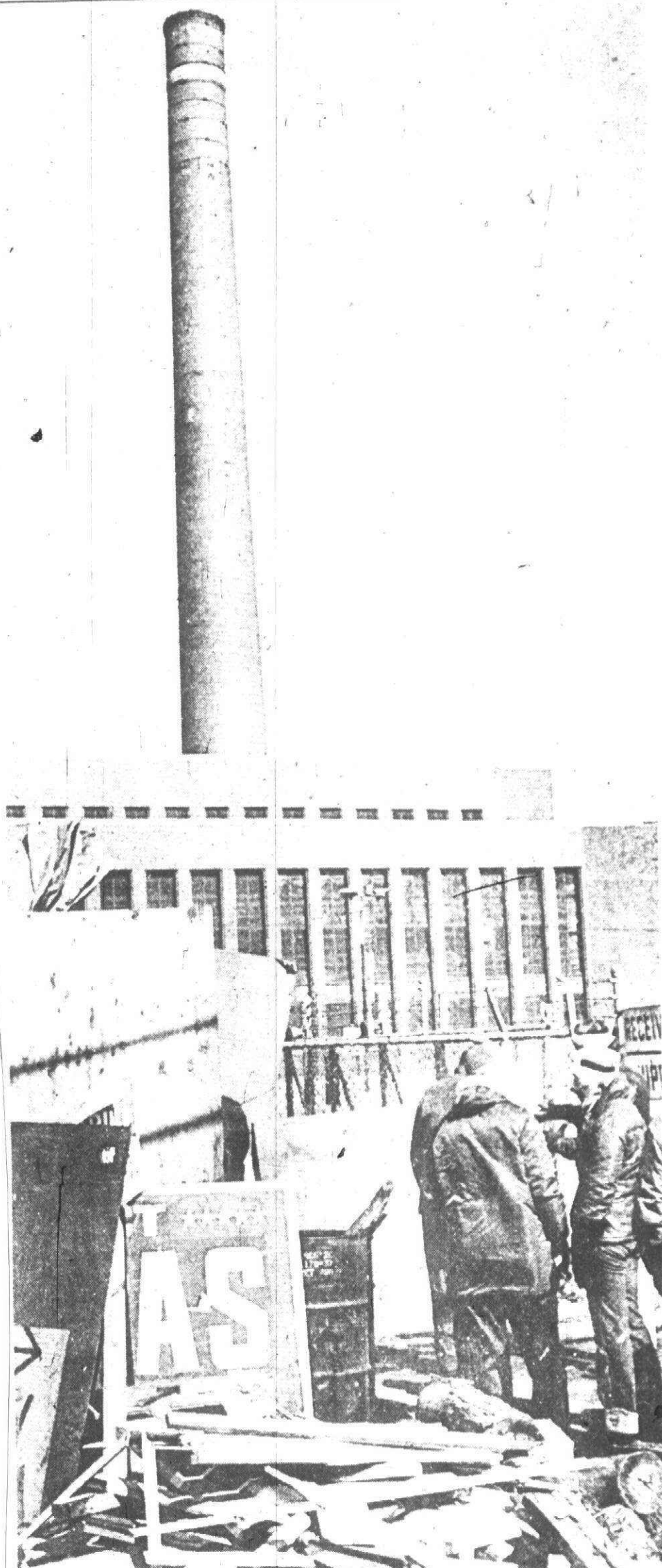
"We don't want to hurt the company. We just want them to share with us

some of their enormous profits."

According to Allen, this is the third strike at Burrough's since members unionized in 1964. The first strike in 1967 lasted for five weeks and the next strike, in 1976, lasted for about three weeks.

"We'll stay out as long as it takes to get a good contract," he said.

"We're hoping for a prompt settlement," added Jackson. According to Watts, the UAW also represents some 100 clerical and office workers at Burrough's. These employees are represented by Local 1440 and are still on the job. Their contract doesn't expire for another month. As for those represented by Local 1313, the largest number of these assembly workers earn about \$7.85 an hour with the cost-of-living factor included, Watts said.

## The twilight of poaching City will end illegal parking

Poachers beware.

The days of free parking in somebody else's lot are about to end.

City Manager Henry Graper Jr. revealed Monday night that the city is negotiating the lease of private parking lots downtown so it will be able to begin ticketing poachers.

The crackdown is aimed at eliminating the practice of employees parking for free on private lots which are supposed to be used by customers.

When poachers are forced to park in public lots, Graper explained, then the city will have a better understanding of the real need for parking spaces in the downtown business district.

THE LEASING of private lots is the first step in an investigation of the feasibility of building a parking deck at the Central Parking Lot.

The second step is to hire an architectural/engineering firm to do the preliminary engineering work including schematic drawings.

Monday night the Plymouth City Commission authorized Graper to contract for the preliminary engineering at a cost of \$12,000 to \$15,000.

The fee for the study will be 1½ to 2 percent of the total project cost, now estimated at about \$850,000.

Graper and Ken West, city engineer, will be interviewing five firms today and tomorrow. Once a decision is made on which firm to hire, Graper will draw up a contract to be signed by the mayor and clerk.

After the preliminary engineering work is finished, Graper said a series of public meetings would be scheduled to explain the project to residents and interested businesspersons.

THE MANAGER STRESSED Monday night that the leasing of the private lots was an important factor in the analysis of need for the deck.

"Once we begin policing the lots we'll know better how many spaces we'll actually need."

Graper said the major private lot owners already are agreeable to the leasing arrangement and that

he was very confident other private lot owners also would agree.

Commissioner Mark Wehmeyer asked if it was wise to spend up to \$16,000 on the preliminary engineering and then face the chance that the downtown merchants would refuse to participate in the financing of the deck.

"We'll take the positive approach that it can be done," responded Graper. "I'll be proven wrong only if I can't sell the plan to merchants. I'll be laying out the idea to the Chamber so I will know within 15 days whether there's support from merchants. If there isn't we can stop right there and we will have spent nothing."

"The real proof, though, will be seen once we began policing the private lots and moving cars to where they belong. That will take about 45 days, and then some merchants may discover they need two or three more spaces for their employees."

"We will be policing two to three major private lots immediately and eventually will have some 15 lots under lease throughout the city."

In response to a question from the audience, Graper commented: "Parking in the city is paying for itself now. What we are trying to do is eliminate poaching — the practice where employees will park in a private lot all day long."

"By the city removing the poachers we will force the business owners to make a decision on what to do about parking for their employees."

Parts of the upper deck of a structure at Central Lot would be reserved for employee parking, Graper added, at a cost of about \$22.50 to \$25 per month per space.

The private lots would remain privately owned, he explained, but would be leased to the city only so city police could enforce parking restrictions.

Tax revenue generated by private lots plus other parking income would be used to pay off the debt for the Central deck, Graper said.

Commissioner Eldon Martin stressed that Graper's plans include the removal of all meters so there eventually would be free parking throughout the city at some time in the future.

## CEP bands go to the top

Members of the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP) Symphony and Concert Bands earned the right to perform in the state band festival next month by receiving first division ratings at the district festival on Saturday.

The Symphony Band, under the direction of James R. Griffith, received ones from the three judges on its concert performance and a one for its sight reading ability.

The Concert Band is under the leadership of Carl Battishill and received ones in the concert performance and a two in sight reading.

In band festivals each band must perform three concert selections that have been rehearsed and then two pieces that have never been seen before. The band is given seven minutes to look over the new music before having to perform.

The CEP Varsity Band received a second division by earning one first division rating in the concert performance along with two, two's and a two in sight reading.

The Symphony Band participated in the class AAA division, the Concert Band in class A and the Varsity Band in class C.

"This board and the community should realize that a full-time treasurer, unless it's the appropriate person with an appropriate background, won't be able to solve any problems," said Trustee Carol Bodenmiller.

She suggested hiring a full-time department head with background in finance and accounting instead.

But Trustee Robert Greenstein

countered, "We hope in a race for full-time treasurer that qualified people will run."

In related action Tuesday night, the board placed the treasurer's wages in the same bracket as the clerk's. The elected official will receive \$30,000 a year when a Dec. 1 wage hike takes effect.

Board members indicated that they may consider the need for a full-time treasurer's assistant at a future date.

currently makes \$23,500, was hiked to \$29,500 retroactive to March 1. Those wages will be boosted to \$32,500 next Dec. 1.

The Township Board Tuesday night unanimously approved the salary increases recommended by Finance Director Mike Gorman. Until now, the elected administrators have earned less than all department heads, whose salaries range from \$25,627 to \$27,265.

The clerk and supervisor received their last salary increase in July 1979. The treasurer has not received a wage increase since November 1974, according to Personnel Director Dan Durack.

"If we don't take this action and raise the pay to a reasonable level, you'll have trouble getting a good field of candidates in November," said Trustee Steve Larson. "As the old saying goes, 'If you want to play, you've got to pay.'"

on an attorney's opinion on the validity of the entire statute.

He has been working for grants from private foundations to fund the development rights plan.

Township attorney Dave Berry said his firm has not been asked for an opinion on the legality of adopting AGI zoning without a working development rights plan.

Legally, landowners must be reimbursed for their lost development rights.

"But until water and sewer services are available, it's unlikely that anyone would argue about (AGI)," he said.

Jim Kosteva, head of Canton's planning department, said zoning western Canton for 2 1/2-acre homesites would not destroy the township's commitment to farmland preservation. Little development has taken place in that area, despite present zoning for half-acre, one-acre and five-acre residential lots.

But Kosteva prefers zoning the land for AGI. That classification carries out the intent of the township's master land use plan to preserve farmland.

All five township board members who were elected in 1978 campaigned on the platform of preserving the township's agricultural land.

and sore throat.

"It can hit some students harder than others. We're urging parents to check with their physicians if their child has any of these symptoms," Mrs. Walker said.

"It's a pretty good number (of cases)," said Dr. Polkowski. "We have scarlet fever reported in other areas of the county, too. It's not unusual for this time of year."

"Scarlet fever is strep throat with a

rash, and the treatment is the same — penicillin if the person isn't allergic to it," Dr. Polkowski continued. "It's important to inform parents, which the school district has done."

"Parents should check with their physician if their child has a sore

throat. Don't wait for a rash," Dr. Polkowski added. "People are anxious because there has been so much in the paper lately about Reye's," said Mrs. Walker. "We're keeping close counts on communicable conditions in the district."

tioned either and could not be used on the ESY system.

BOARD MEMBERS also explained why the increase in assessments many residents are experiencing will not mean a subsequent raise in school revenue.

According to Hoedel, a state equalizing formula reduces the amount of state funds received by the district in proportion to the increase in assessments. At some time in the future, the district could conceivably be in the position of receiving no state funds.

Although at least two board members stated their personal preference on grade realignment (Stephen Harper calls it simply putting off the inevitable, Carol Davis thinks it's a feasible alternative), all stressed the necessity of renovating Central Middle school.

"We chose to put large sums of money in our instructional budget rather than in maintenance," Ms. Davis said.

"Now it's caught up with us." Under the ballot proposals, Proposition I would provide more than \$8 million to renovate Central. Proposition II, if passed, would allow another \$2 million to be spent to convert the school for high school use by about 1,200 students.

Proposition I does not specify how the school would be used — simply that it will be brought up to present building code standards. But it would remain as a middle school if Proposition II failed.

Some audience questions referred to the Proposition I bond request, which is some \$4 million higher than had been recommended by a citizen's bond committee.

HOEDEL SAID the increased cost comes from the board's decision to include purchase of 13 school buses and the installation of an elevator at Central in the proposal.

Board Member Sylvia Stetz said a new school could be built for the \$8

million cost of a Central renovation, but that the school could not house nearly as many students as Central is capable of.

Hoedel agreed with one comment, that it is not legally required of the district to bring Central up to present building codes because of a grandfather clause. "But it gets to the point where you can't in good conscience put children in a building with 30-year-old electrical wiring."

Board member Stephen Harper added, "I work for Ford Motor Company, and I can't think of a single structure the company uses that is in as appalling condition as this one is (the forum was held at Central)."

And what if the propositions fail? Board Member Richard Arlen said, "if

only Proposition II passes, we will consider not selling bonds."

Ms. Tonda said there is a possibility the board will come back with bond requests if they fail in the election.

Board members expressed the hope that "any perceived split" on the board would not jeopardize the proposals.

All seemed in agreement that, although no single projection of expected student population crunches in the schools can be considered the last word on the matter, schools are approaching or exceeding capacity already, especially in the high schools.

Arlen said, "If one perceives growth in the community has stabilized, we'll be able to squeak through."

"If we're only in a holding pattern and growth will start up again, it will change all the projections."

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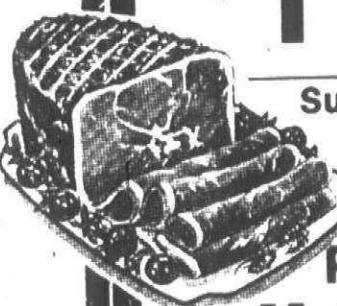
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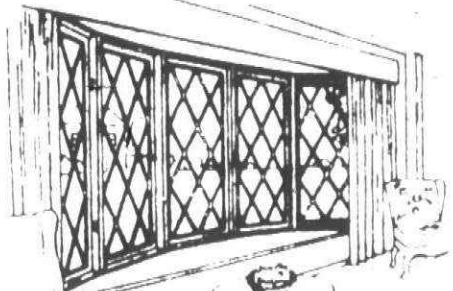
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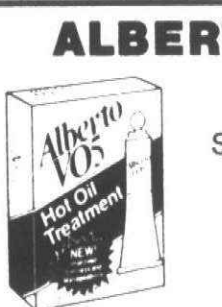
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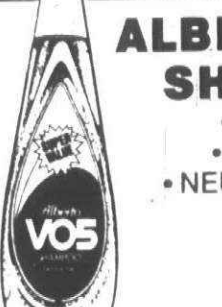
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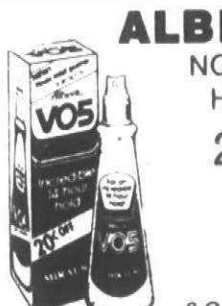

# City officials join in support of court's plan

The city of Plymouth has gone on record as favoring the idea of a single court house to serve all the communities within the 35th District Court.

Monday night the city commission voted 7-0 to support the single courtroom approach, although it still is unknown in which community the court will be located.

Earlier the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees voted to endorse the single courtroom concept.

In urging the commission to support the one-courthouse plan, City Manager Henry Graper stressed that he hoped the city would be able to provide quarters for the court.

Graper said he proposed two or three sites in the city for the court but those locations were voted down by the committee searching for a site.

"I'm only one member of that committee with one vote, and the majority of the committee voted down those proposed sites. The committee has not yet disqualified my proposal to use a site next to the Massey Ball Field."

The advantage of the Massey site, Graper said, is there would be a common parking lot which could be shared by the court and persons using the softball diamonds at night and on weekends.

Plymouth Township is proposing that the court be located on property near Haggerty and Joy, and Canton is asking that the facility be built on land near Joy and Morton Taylor (Main Street extended into Canton).

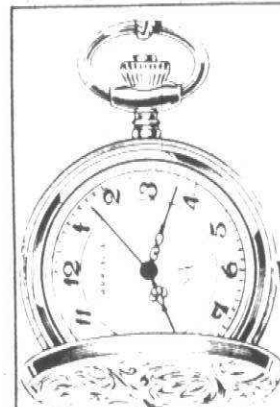
"I'll do all I can to keep the court in the city," Graper assured the commission. "But if I do it will be because our offer constitutes the best financial package for the court."

"If the city is not successful in locating the court here, we still want a single court house because that will saving about \$100,000 a year in the operation of the district court."

"The committee will do what's in the best interest of all the residents of the court district — that's the way the way the game should be played."

Graper added he had no problem with both judges sitting in facilities in the city hall, but he couldn't find the space there the judges desired.

"Because of this it will be better for the court to find its own building and then we can use city hall for the needs of our departments and not have to worry about whether the court might move out in some future year."



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# Small holes found on 4-month-old M-14 highway

Scattered surface holes in sections of the new M-14 freeway in Wayne County don't indicate that the \$32 million road is deteriorating, says a district engineer for the Michigan Department of Transportation.

"I don't feel that we have a problem," said Warren Cox, chief engineer of the M-DOT district office in Southfield. "If we start getting some serious cracks, some large cracks, than we have a serious problem on our hands."

Cox says the holes -- most prominent in the eastbound lane of the freeway, between Beck and Sheldon Roads -- are not "a serious thing."

"To go out and repair those would be a cosmetic thing," said Cox, adding that the department has no plans to make repairs. The 12-mile stretch of new freeway between Livonia and Ann Arbor has been open less than five months.

THE HOLES WERE reportedly caused by a bad mix of concrete.

"In my opinion," said Cox, "we obviously got one bad bunch of aggregate there in the concrete mix." Aggregate is one of the materials in concrete. On the majority of M-14, Cox said, slag aggregate, a by-product of steel production, was used rather than natural stone aggregate.

Some "foreign material," reportedly mudballs, was in the aggregate when the concrete was mixed, Cox said. The mudballs have "no structural value; it just creates voids," the term he used for the holes.

COX WAS responding to a Detroit

News article published earlier this week which warned the freeway holes could be more serious than state transportation officials admit.

A structural engineer the News hired to inspect M-14 said the problem could become worse since the freeway has only been exposed to traffic for a short time.

Dr. Phil Almeida, the News consultant, is a professor of civil engineering at the University of Detroit. He was quoted by the paper as saying the topsoil in the aggregate would "definitely weaken the concrete."

The aggregate slag used for the section west of Sheldon Road was provided by Edward C. Levy Co. of Detroit, according to the M-DOT.

But Cox said he didn't know "if we have a very good case to prove Levy responsible" for the bad batch of concrete.

If the department were to pursue the matter, "what would we ask for?" Cox said. "A new pavement? I don't know if we need a new pavement."

THE WAYNE COUNTY portion of M-14 is maintained by the county road commission.

When asked how serious the M-14 surface holes were, Robert Mahoney, a road commission maintenance engineer, said, "I don't really know."

"Quite frequently we encounter things on a new road that become maintenance problems."

Mahoney said he had yet to inspect the road, but a road commission district yard supervisor had.

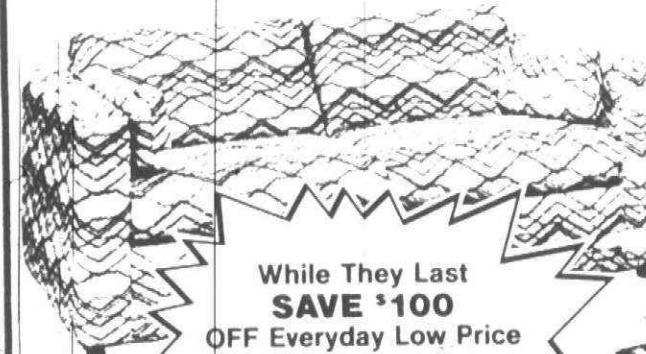

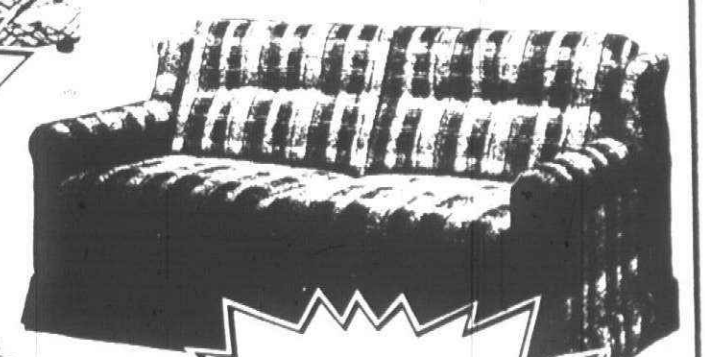

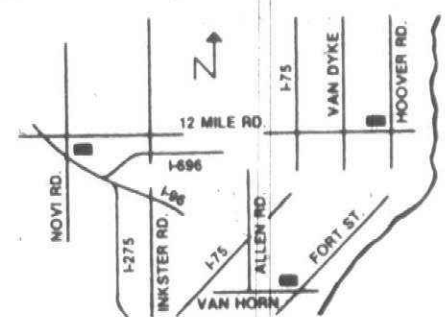

## Local auto dealers respond to slumping car sales

So you think you have problems. Income taxes are due soon. Meat prices along with all foodstuffs are skyrocketing. Property taxes soaring and there seems to be no end.

But consider the automobile dealer. He's had a bad winter. Unemployment cut down the number of prospective customers. His inventory is high because of a slump in sales and the floor plan interest (interest on the bank loans on cars in the show room) have reached a new high of about 17 per

cent. The price of money is going up. It is becoming more difficult to obtain loans from banks for their customers. And this condition has gotten to the point where buyers who could have obtained a bank loan a year ago are now being turned down.

On top of all this, the mild winter has cut down the collisions on ice and snow. As a result, the body shops have been short of work.

"What would you have done if you still had a Buick dealership?" Jack Selle was asked.

"I'd pray," he said "and hope for the

best."

"I never like to talk bad about business," remarked Leo Calhoun, the Ford dealer on Plymouth Road, "but we have been down about 17 per cent, but I am looking forward to a good month in March and that will be the light at the end of the tunnel."

He explained that with the high interest rates, a dealer now has to watch his expenses, watch his inventory and adjust to meet any crisis.

Under this thinking, Calhoun confid-

ed that he had to cut 12 people from his staff. They were cut from the office, service department and parts.

"The problem may be solving itself," he went on, "as more people are coming in. And the rebate program has helped."

Aside from the rebate program, Calhoun has partially solved the problem by having special sales. One of these was a special night for all Ford Co. employees. And it proved fruitful.

In this so called crisis among the

dealers, Calhoun saw hope with the movement of used cars, but there still is a bit of reluctance to obtain a smaller car after being accustomed to a larger one.

Much the same sort of problem exists at the Lou La Riche Chevrolet agency on Plymouth Road.

There, the main trouble is the floor plan interest and the 17 per cent interest which boosted expenses to the danger point.

Management cited the demand for

larger down payments and shorter term contracts as one of the problems. Under these demands it was said people just don't have the money to put down larger amounts and then face higher monthly payments.

At the La Riche dealership, the work staff was cut 10 per cent and all overtime work was eliminated.

The salesmen all agreed that the mild winter has been a blessing in disguise in that it enabled the prospective customer to keep outdoors looking at the models.

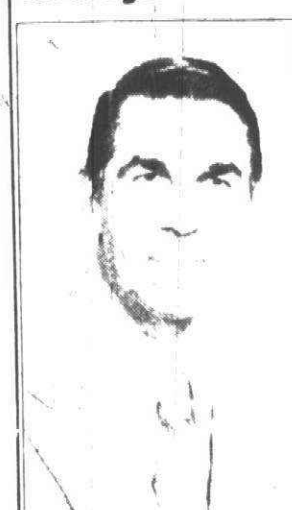

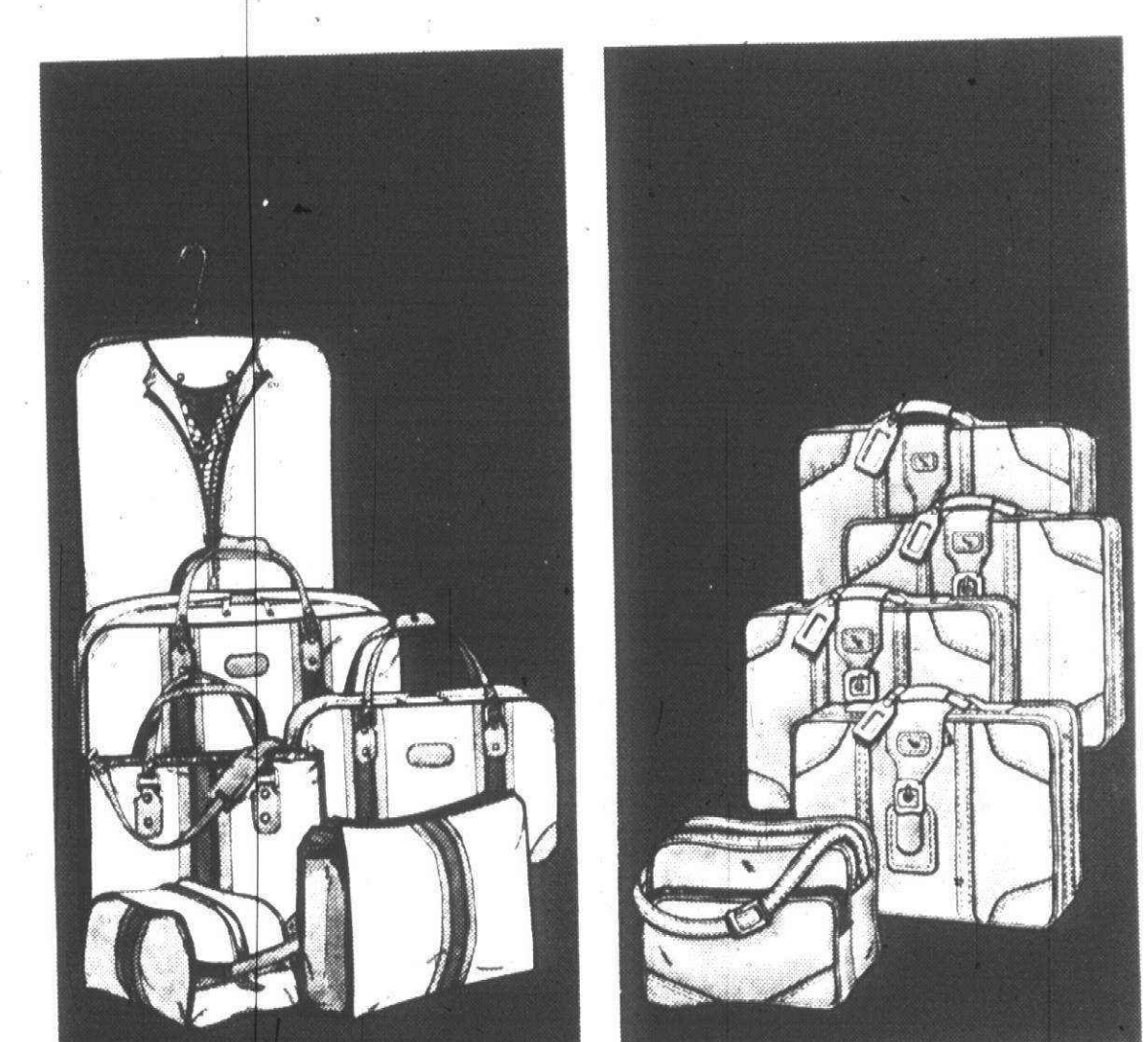

For that reason, I refuse to get a facelift. I have earned these wrinkles. They show the real me, and I refuse to mutilate them.

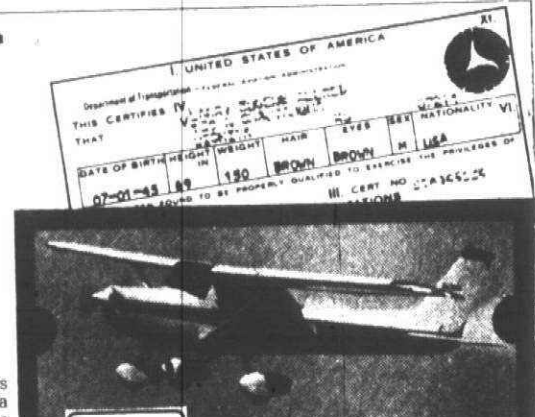

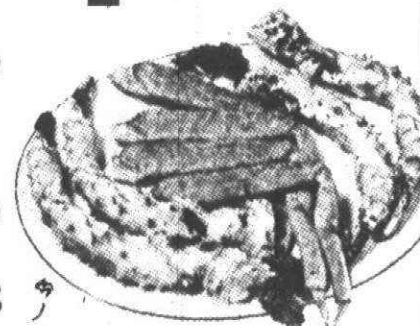


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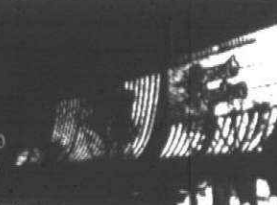

## Energy problem needs do-it-yourself goals

Have you thought about growing your own energy? Perhaps you should. That may not be as crazy as it sounds.

Area Jaycees recently sponsored a debate on energy, and the lack of it. Discussion centered on Detroit Edison Co.'s Fermi II nuclear power plant scheduled to open in the next couple of years near Monroe.

There are no simple solutions to problems posed by using nuclear energy or from problems caused by the lack of power without it. That much was clear from the debate. Both representatives from Detroit Edison and the Safe Energy Coalition (SECO) agreed that statistics, impressive-sounding

experts and reports can be found backing both sides of the issue.

After listening to SECO lecturer David Plank expound on the use of "solar technologies" including conservation, Edison senior nuclear engineer Raymond Berg remarked that Americans long ago opted for a system of specialization in which everyone does her own thing.

"I expect (farmers) to grow my corn," Berg said. "You can always form your own cooperative, but you can never do it (generate electricity) cheaper than we can."

THINK ABOUT WHAT he said for a moment.

How many of you have grown your own corn, among other vegetables — and enjoyed doing it? Sure, farmers and manufacturers provide for most of what we need, but growing numbers of persons are farming small plots to provide for the needs of their own families.

Others have formed food co-ops to buy family groceries at a cost and quality unavailable at local checkout counters.

Besides cost and quality, there seems to be the American do-it-yourself philosophy at work here. What people are doing is down-sizing enormous, overwhelming problems to a level at which they can understand and cope.

Individual Americans may not be able to solve the world hunger or energy problems, but perhaps they can do a good job of providing for themselves.

PERHAPS GROUPS like SECO could be more effective if, instead of just opposing nuclear energy, they planted the seeds of alternate technologies.

Those seeds could take the form of workshops and printed materials on how to generate, store and conserve energy. That way local residents could reap a harvest of energy.

Those local harvests may never replace the need for central power generating plants operated by Detroit Edison. But they could go a long way toward preventing energy-starved blackouts.



## Like kids, we won't play at the Russians' house

I'm troubled with the decision that the United States won't send a team to the summer Olympics because the Soviet Union won't remove its troops from Afghanistan.

It is politicizing something which shouldn't be politicized.

Over the last couple of years, the kindest thing you can say about U.S. foreign policy is that it has not been too effective. Many would call it a disaster.

Because we have been unable to accomplish our international goals, we are saying, like little children, that we are not going to Russia's house to play.

THE FIRST recorded Olympic Games were held in 776 B.C. on the plains of Olympia in Elis, Greece. This event consisted of a 200-yard footrace.

The Greeks expanded the Games and held them every four years. In the beginning, only free Greek citizens could compete, and the competition was entirely amateur with the only prizes being laurel wreaths.

Over the years, civic rivalry led to trickery and professionalism, and the Games became degraded. After Rome conquered Greece, Roman emperors turned the Olympic Games into a massive circus. The games were finally discontinued by decree of the Roman emperor in A.D. 394.

The modern Olympic Games were resurrected in Athens in 1896 as a result of the efforts of a French educator, Baron Pierre de Coubertin. He believed that because boys and athletics have gone together through the ages, education and athletics might go hand-in-hand in producing better international understanding.

ALTHOUGH NATIONS send teams to the Olym-

pics, the whole effort is to recognize individual achievement. There is no official score-keeping of how many medals each country has won.

The purpose of the Olympic Games is to let the great amateur athletes of the world compete with each other in a spirit of peace and friendship.

The U.S. government does not field the teams we send. The United States Olympic Committee, which is privately funded, does.

If the U.S. plays politics with the Games, the result probably will be the same as when the Greek cities started to play politics and eventually killed the whole program.

YOUNG AMERICANS have been training over the last four years to try for international recognition. Because youth isn't lasting, those who lose a chance this year may never have another opportunity.

Shouldn't the U.S., as a world leader, be a little more mature and not hurt an international sports event because its political games aren't going well?

The Olympic Games are to promote sportsmanship and international understanding. Our country doesn't seem to be doing a good job at either of these areas.

## New magazine tells glories of Michigan

LAST NOVEMBER, the first issue of Eberly's Michigan Journal rolled off the presses.

In her Editor's Notebook, Carole wrote, "If you love Michigan, you'll love this magazine. If you'd rather be in Hawaii, you'll probably still like the magazine because it's about all the interesting, crazy and wonderful people who inhabit Michigan. It's about all the unusual, off-beat and beautiful places that surround you."

The next 30 pages went on to prove what Carole was bragging about. And the pace has continued through successive editions. There have been stories about an East Jordan artist, a fellow in Traverse City who has been writing for 62 years, a non-joiners club in Sparta, and a great cook in Michigan from Crystal Lake.

FOR THE BUSINESS-MINDED of my profession, upon seeing Carole's new publication, there is the quick question, "Where's the advertising? You can't publish a magazine printed on fine enamel stock with dabs of color without a lot of ad revenue."

No one knows that better than Carole. But she and her husband, John, a fire department lieutenant in Meridian Township, made a pact — they'd produce a quality magazine and then start to sell advertising.

In fact, their game plan indicates they'll be laboring up to three years before hitting a break-even point. That means hacking out nearly \$6,200 an issue for writers and printer with a limited amount of income from subscription and newsstand sales.

HOW CAN A YOUNG COUPLE chug along at this pace with only limited revenue? Very carefully, might be Carole's smiling response.

Remember, I mentioned earlier that Carole had authored some books. Five are about cooking and recipes — including such diverse areas as 101 recipes using apples, Michigan ethnic recipes, a spread for mushrooms and colonial fireplace delicacies.

Right from her first cookbook, titled Michigan Cooking . . . and other things, the books have sold briskly.

And they still are selling. Carole and John are tapping these profits to help bankroll the magazine.

I MET CAROLE AND JOHN in their East Lansing home last week and found them to be a serious, bright and gutsy, yet relaxed couple. Carole quit her job with UPI when daughter Jessica arrived five years ago.

Raising a child was fine, but Carole wanted somehow to continue her writing. Always a lover of the kitchen, she quickly settled on skills of the kitchen as her field.

It proved an excellent choice. The initial press run for the first collection of recipes was 2,000.

"How many orders did you have?" "Three," chuckled Carole. "We just loaded up the van with books and started to sell them."

Total sales to date: 20,000.

CAROLE LIVED A RATHER exotic life as a youngster. Her dad, Paul Walaskay of Old Port Road in Birmingham, is a Ford Motor Co. engineer. The family lived in Dearborn during Carole's younger days and she attended the now defunct Greenfield Village School.

Recalls Carole, "What other fifth-grader learned to weave on huge looms or sit at Henry Ford's

## Many advantages in wide-angle lens

When it comes to buying that first accessory lens, most amateur photographers opt for the telephoto.

f/22, you never have to focus the camera as long as you are at least 10 inches from the subject.

Bringing a far-away subject up close is too tempting to pass up, and having all those inches of lens in front of us can make us look and feel like pros.

**SECOND, YOU CAN** get by with much slower shutter speeds with a wide-angle lens — a nice advantage when your light is limited.

But did you know that through selective cropping and enlarging, you can achieve a similar effect with your normal lens? I'm not detracting from the telephoto lens usefulness. It serves a vital function, and I have many which I use often. I'm trying to get you to think "wide angle" and realize its worth.

A 28 mm lens can be safely hand held (free from shutter release shake) at 1/30 second, but a 17 mm lens can be held at 1/15, or even 1/8 second.

With slow speed film, low level light and a desire to maximize depth of field, this can be quite an advantage. Try shooting a telephoto or normal lens at these shutter speeds and see your shaky results.

Many photographers ask about distortion, the bending of light rays characteristic of wide-angle lenses. Buildings will curve upwards and subjects may begin to look unreal. It happens, and there may be situations when distortion is undesirable.

But the inherent distortion of wide-angle lenses can be turned to one of your biggest advantages. Selective distortion can be a plus. Strength, drama, excitement can be added to your photographs through proper use of distortion.

Creatively used, distortion can emphasize certain parts of a picture and can give a photograph an artistic quality no other lens can produce. Sweeping foregrounds and bold subject framing are easily attainable. And you can deliberately exploit the wide-angle lens' tendency to exaggerate the size of close objects at the expense of distant ones.

Mastering the use of wide-angle lenses can also give you to a better understanding of normal and telephoto lenses.

## Principals misled by vanity critics

Editor:

We wish to respond to an article in the Jan. 31 issue of the Observer entitled "Who's Who book a big 'So What'?"

The article quotes two local principals as well as the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) as criticizing our publication and others because we are a for-profit organization and, therefore, it is implied that our motives are "non-academic" and that we are simply attempting to sell books, pins and ceramic steins to students and their families.

All our literature to students and schools emphasizes our policy that there are no financial obligations whatsoever contingent upon recognition in our publication. In fact, the vast majority of students recognized each year do not buy the book or related award items but do receive the recognition they have earned and deserve.

Each year we distribute about 15,000 free copies of our book to participating high schools and youth organizations, colleges and libraries. This distribution encourages listed students to view the book and their biography conveniently and without cost.

To be included, students must have a "B" or better grade point average and demonstrated leadership in extra-curricular activities. In the past three years more than 35,000 students who submitted biographical materials were rejected upon review, necessitating the return of more than \$168,000 in orders. This is hardly the policy of an organization intent upon selling books to students and parents or willing to compromise their professional standards for the profit motive.

With all due respect to the local principals, it is important to note that their criticism basically emanates from the NASSP. The NASSP has issued six reasons for not participating in "who's who-type" publications, and these reasons were quoted in the Observer article.

Not mentioned in the article, however, is the fact that the NASSP sponsors the National Honor Society — the largest student recognition program in the country.

The NASSP criticizes "Who's Who" publishers for selling pins (\$7.95) and steins (\$8.95) to students and their families although their own catalog offers

24 related items including pins (\$10.25), plaques (\$15) and blazers (\$35).

The NASSP and your local principals also imply that listing in "who's who-type" books might result in the unauthorized sale of student lists. We do not sell out student list to any organization for any purpose, and the NASSP has been unwilling or unable to identify any organization which does. Yet the NASSP conveniently ignores the well-publicized activity of Educational Testing Service which conducts the SAT examination and flagrantly sells those lists at exorbitant prices. Clearly there is a double standard among some educators for for-profit and not-for-profit organizations.

In spite of the negativism conveyed by local principals, we cannot fault their position because they justifiably rely on the platform of their own respected, national association. It is unfortunate that their association has demonstrated they are unworthy of such blind trust.

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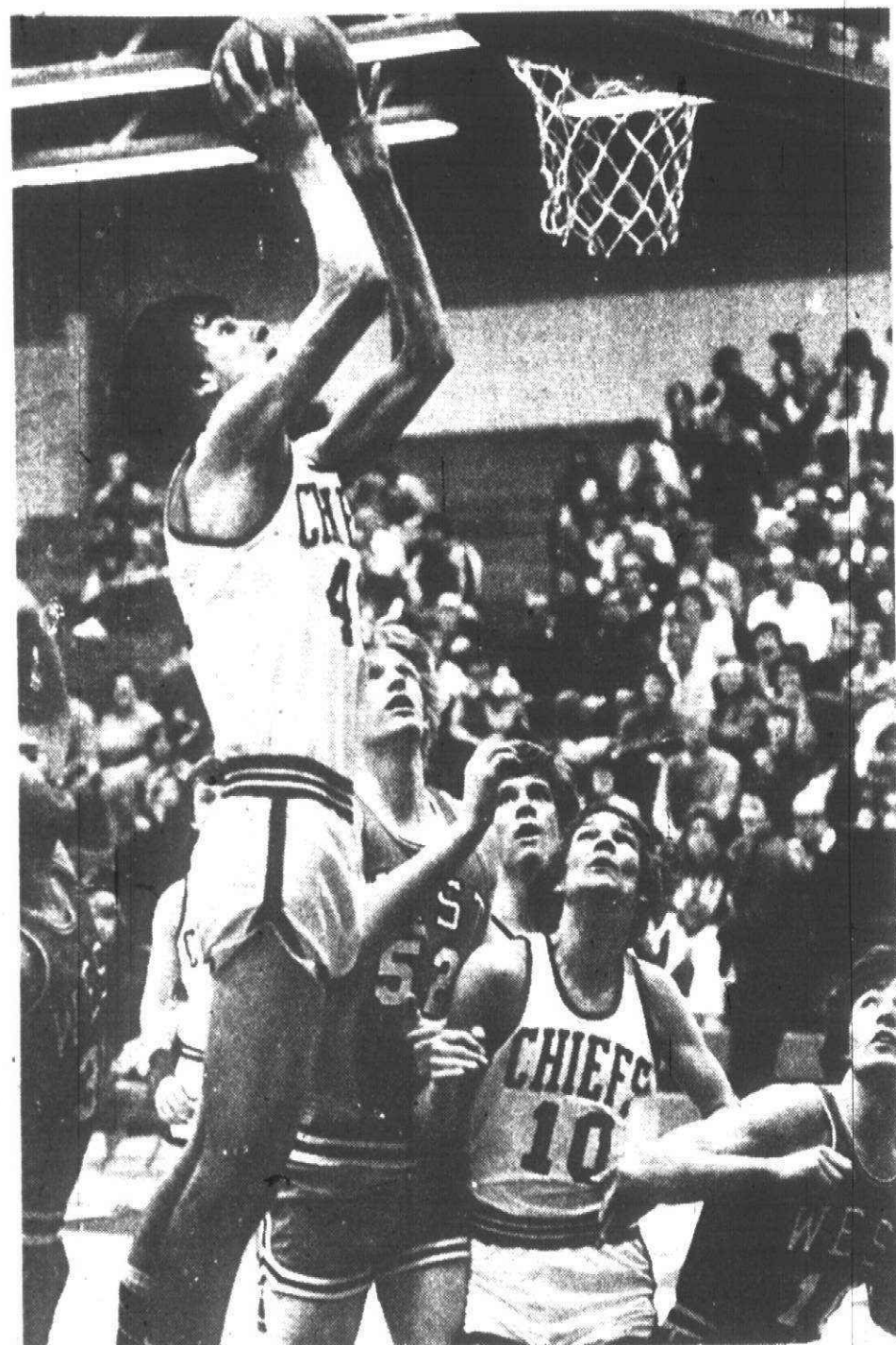

Deadly outside shooting and superior board strength carried Plymouth Canton Monday night to an easy 70-41 district Class A basketball victory over Garden City West.

Canton is now 15-6 overall and has won 10 straight games. West finished the season with a 6-14 record.

Coached by Craig Bell, Canton will now meet Wayne at 7 p.m. Thursday.

West got out of the gate fast, but quickly succumbed to the taller and hot shooting Chiefs.

The Tigers led after one quarter, 10-9, and once upped the margin to four, 19-15, midway through the second period.

Canton, however, began to crack West's tight zone behind the shooting of senior Scott Adler, who tossed in 10 of his game-high 16 points in the second quarter.

Canton went into the dressing room at halftime leading 29-23.

"They shoot too well for us," said veteran West Coach Chris Babler. "We let the game get away from us."

That point came late in the third quarter as Dave Visser, who sat out most of the first half with three personal fouls, also began to find the range.

The Chiefs built a 47-33 advantage at the end of three quarters as Visser canned two free throws with 14 seconds left.

WEST WAS then forced to abandon its zone in favor of a full-court press. Canton quickly put the game out of reach in the final quarter steadily building to its final margin of victory.

With Visser on the bench, Bell first ordered his team to play a man-to-man defense, but shortly after switched to a zone which stymied the Tigers.

"We started stepping out and made them play," said Canton Coach Craig Bell. "In the second half we started

shooting well and got the ball inside. We were moving the ball offensively."

Canton once again received balanced scoring. To go along with Adler's 16, senior forward Brad Westin and Visser added 15 and 14 respectively. Junior center Sean Houle, who chipped in with 12, also had a good night on the boards as he grabbed 13.

"We just don't have the height underneath," said Babler. "Canton is an excellent passing club and are hard to press. They hustled real well."

"Adler was the key tonight. He controls them on offense and plays solid defense."

Adler hit seven of 11 shots from the field. As a team, Canton connected on 26 of 59 for 44 percent.

Forward James Bodrie paced West with 14 points. He made some nice drives to the basket, especially in the first quarter. Guard Jeff Draper added six.

"I'M GLAD to get this one over," Bell said. "Wayne is a big team which matches up real well with us."

"The game will be won on the glass. It should be a good game."

Wayne comes into the showdown with a 14-6 record, which includes an impressive win two weeks ago over high regarded Monroe.

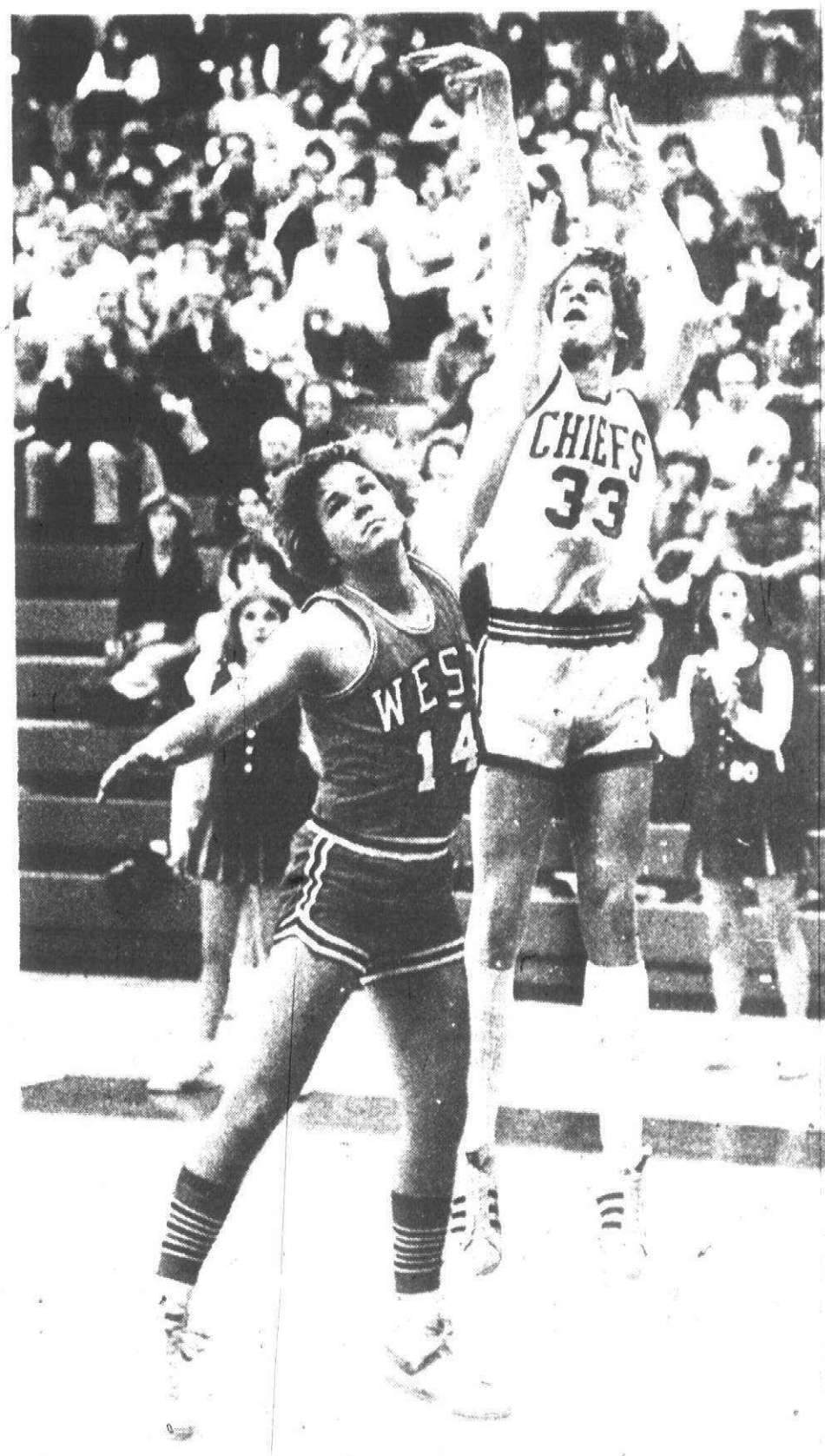

**Tough defense lifts Westland John Glenn, 62-46**

Defense is not taken lightly at Westland John Glenn.

The Rocket cagers advanced to the second round of the Class A district at Plymouth Canton with a 62-46 win over Northwest Suburban League rival Garden City East Tuesday night.

"Robert is a junior who's improving," Henry said. "He had confidence in himself tonight and that should help."

Sisson was able to open up East's

zone defense with his shooting. That allowed Glenn to penetrate inside.

In the final quarter Glenn coasted as East tried to make a fruitless comeback. The Panthers closed the gap to 12 points on two different occasions, but could not come any closer.

"I'm proud of the kids because they did come back," said Riley. "We were at an arm's length most of the night."

Roger Ferguson and John Topalian led East in scoring with 13 and 12, respectively. Glenn Barikmo added 10.

For Glenn, Woodard and Kevin Thweatt each scored 10.

Glenn must now face district favor-

ite Plymouth Salem at 8 p.m. Thursday. The Rockets handed Salem one of its three losses early last month, 68-64.

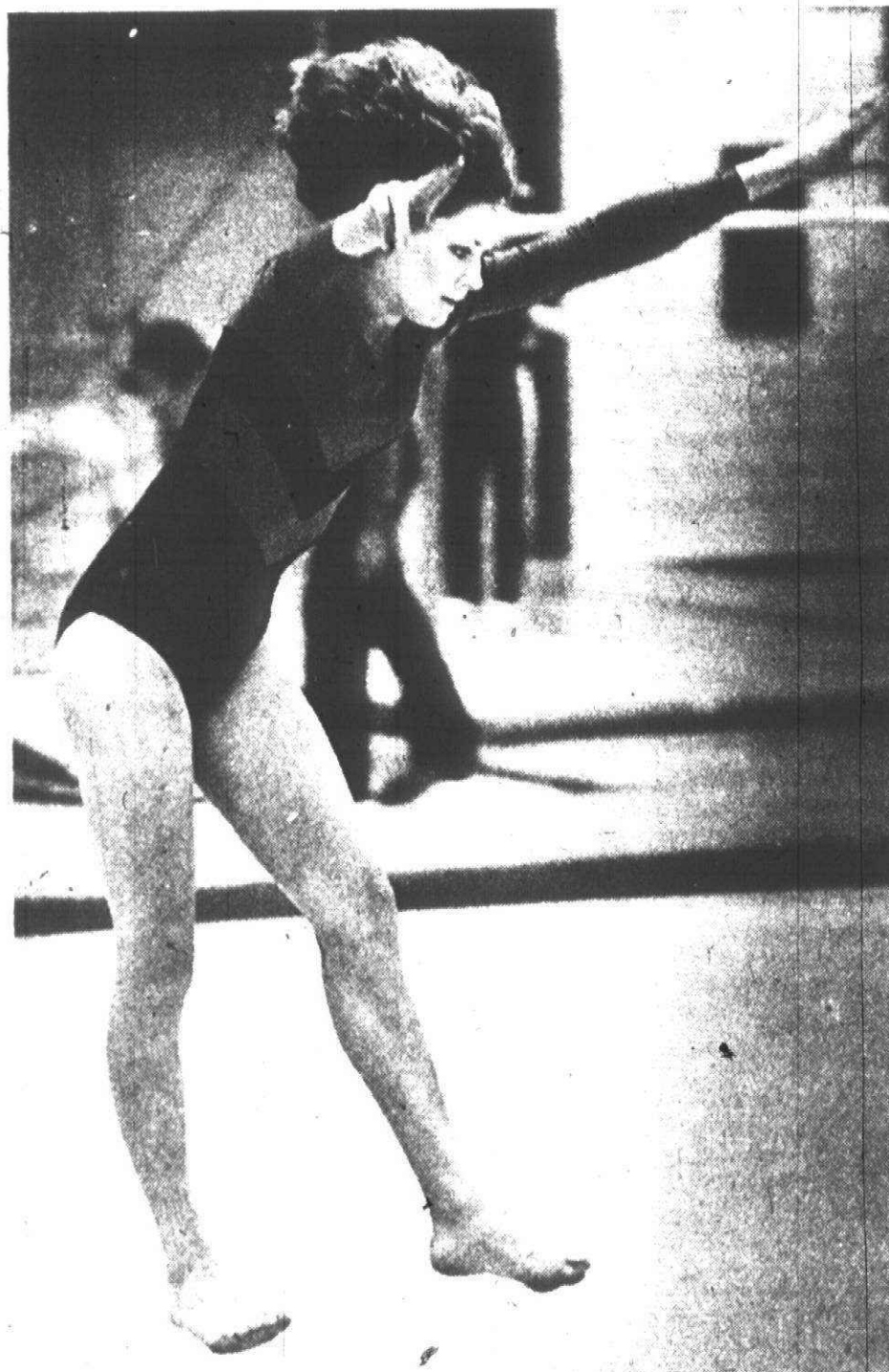

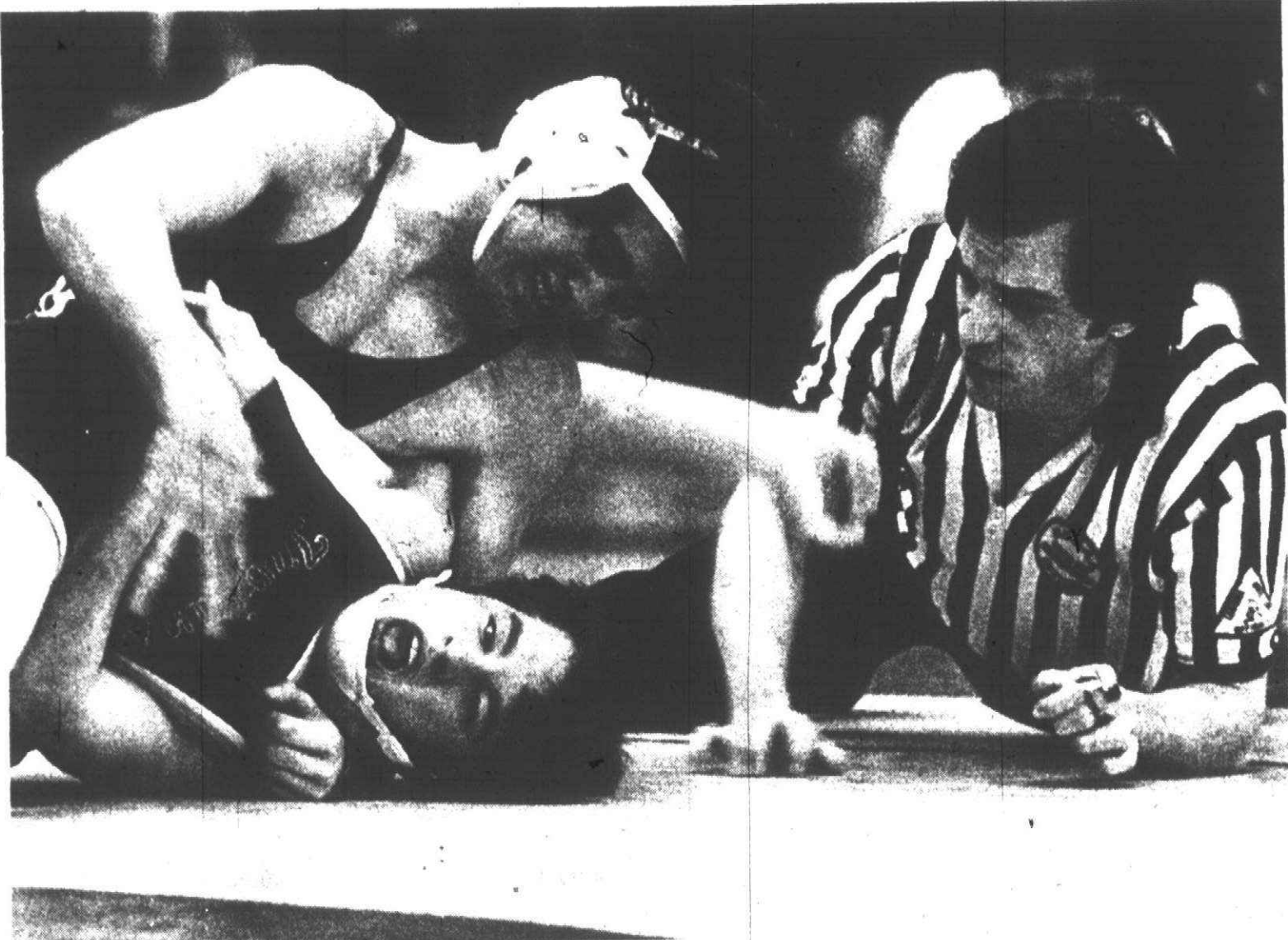

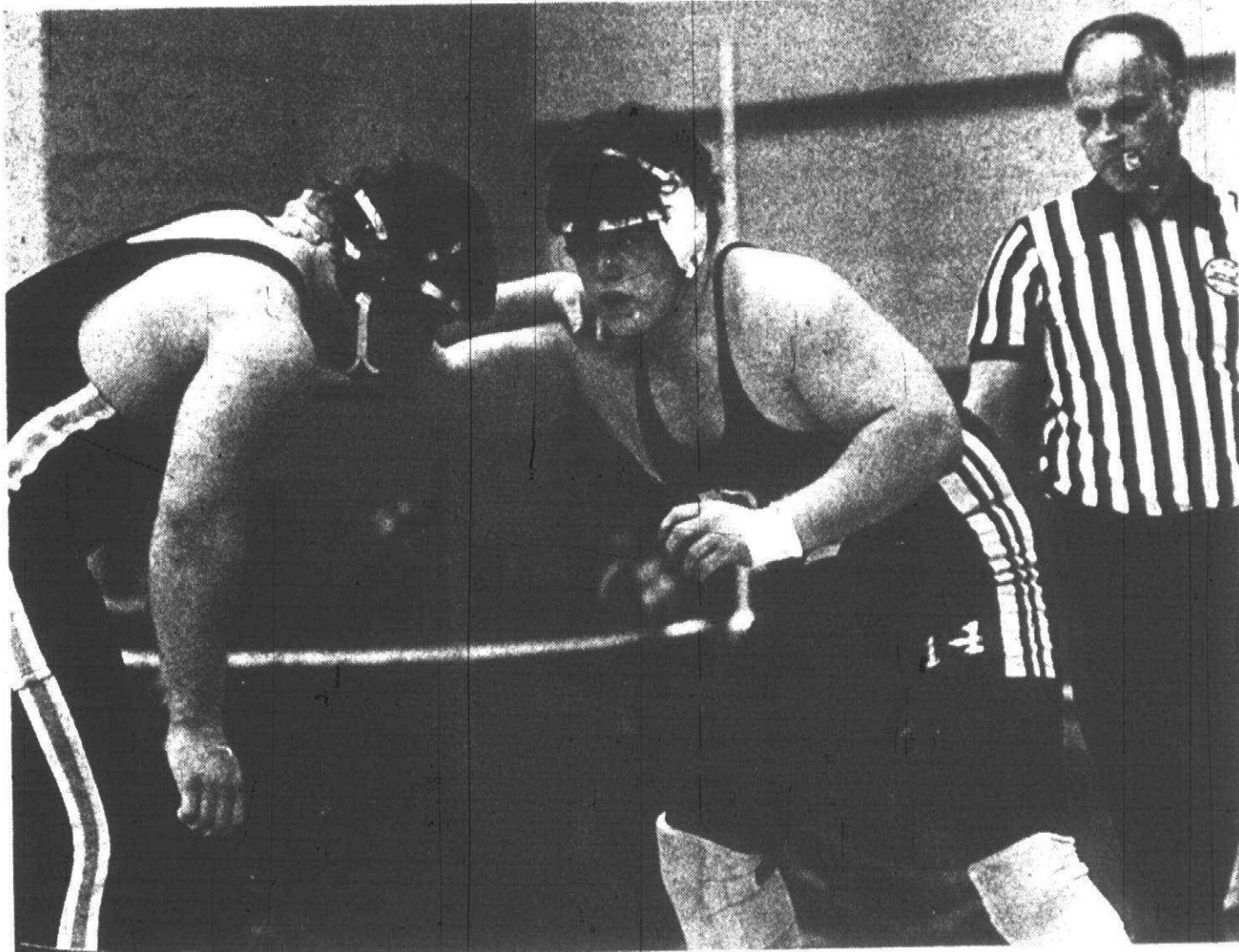
The Rocks went in the medal rounds still in serious contention. At that point they trailed Davison by only seven points.

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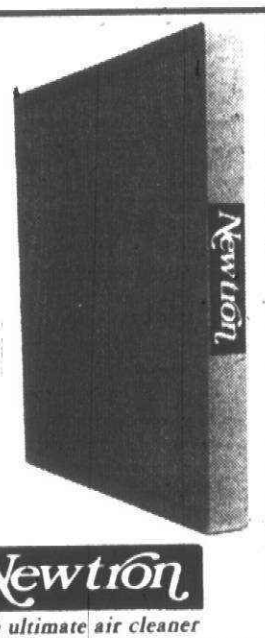
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## Rock gym squad garners 4th spot

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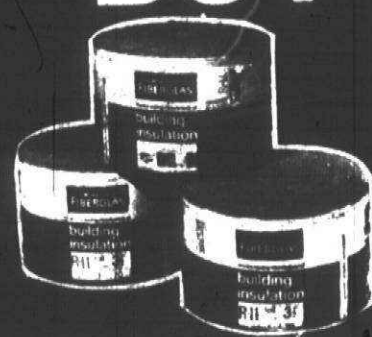
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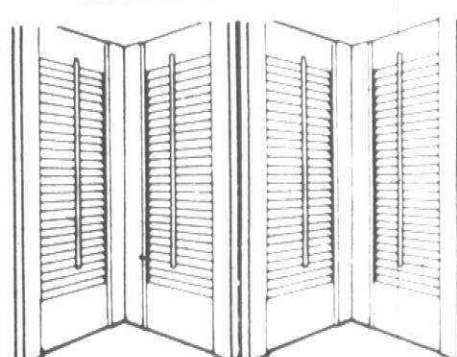
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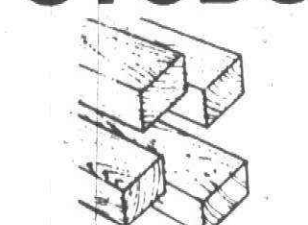
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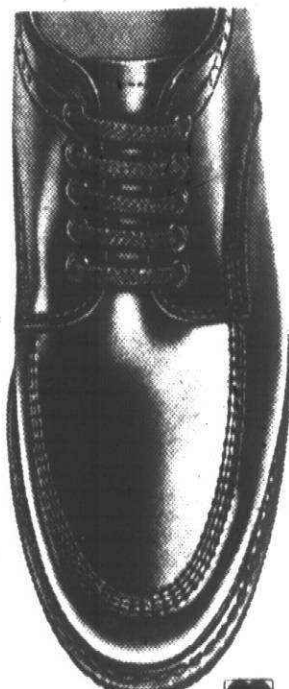
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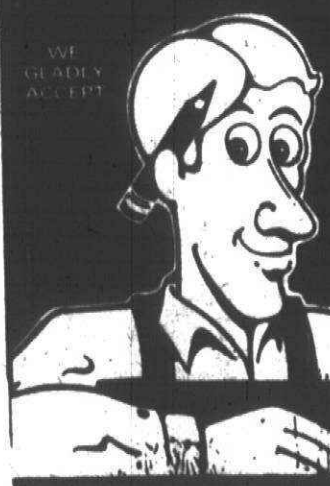


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# Salem JV cagers drop season finale

## On your mark, Get set for Girl Scout cookie sale

A large task force of super salespersons will be sweeping the area, beginning tomorrow, as the 1980 Girl Scouts' cookie caper gets under way.

Junior, cadette and senior Girl Scouts will begin order-taking Friday, March 7 and will continue through Tuesday, March 25. Deliveries will begin April 14 and end April 30. Scouts in the Plymouth-Canton area are members of the Huron Valley Girl Scout Council. The council has set a sales goal of 550,000 packages.

Area cookie chairman is Doris Rorabacher who recalls the goal was 350,000 nine years ago when she served her first hitch cookie chairperson. Each year a new

record has been set locally. In 1979 the scouts sold 62,484 boxes; in 1978 they sold 41,844.

**SCOUTS ARE** their own best customers. They believe — and can vouch for, the quality of their products.

They will be taking orders for seven varieties: sesame wheat crackers, peanut butter patties, shortbread cookies, thin mints, peanut butter sandwich cookies, granola cookies, and vanilla and chocolate sandwich cookies which are new this year.

Before the sale begins, the girls sample the cookies and crackers baked by FFV-Interbake in Michigan.

Selling price this year is \$1.50 per box as inflation has hit even the Girl Scout cookie. Twenty-five cents of each \$1.50 goes to the scout troop, 69 cents go to the council and for sales cost, and 56 cents pays for the actual cost of the cookies.

The council uses its share of the profits to supplement income from United Ways, camping fees, and other contributions to provide Girl Scout services and build and maintain camps, provide financial aid for individual scouts and for services for volunteer troop leaders.

The troops use their profits to buy equipment, pay national mem-

bership registration fees for troop members, and to finance troop camping, trips and service projects.

**THERE ARE SALES** incentives for the scouts. Each girl who participates receives a "Cookie Power" strip which can be worn on uniforms, badge sashes or jackets.

Those who sell 50 or more boxes will earn a patch with the number 50 on it. A patch with the number 100 will go to girls who sell at least 100 boxes, and to those who sell 200, goes the 200 patch. The super salesgirls who sell 300 or more will receive "Super Patch."

And because it is 1980, a new incentive goes to scouts who sell 80 boxes or more. It is a white bandana with a blue border and lettering designed especially for the Huron

Clinton Council scouts.

Each year the council chooses an honorary chairman for the drive. This year it was the Eastern Michigan University cheer squad. In keeping with the theme, scouts were asked to submit cheers to a council contest. Once the winning cheers were selected, members of the EMU cheerleading squad visited each area for a pep rally. The local rally was in mid-February at Plymouth Salem High School.

The three area winners were Natalie Buck of Brownie Troop 669 in the Field Elementary School cluster, Andrea Alex of Brownie Troop 618 of the Field cluster, and Kellie Daily of Junior Troop 216 in the Allen Elementary School cluster.

Brownies cannot sell cookies but they were eligible to enter the cheer-writing contest.

# 2 Girl Scout councils consider consolidation

Two Girl Scout councils with several thousand suburban members will vote March 18 on a consolidation designed to bring the program more into line with needs of girls in the '80s.

If the move is approved, the Girl Scouts of Metropolitan Detroit, which covers Livonia, Garden City, Redford Township and part of Westland, and the South Oakland Girl Scouts will become the Michigan Metro Girl Scouts Council. The latter council includes Farmington, Southfield, Lathrup, Birmingham, Troy and part of West Bloomfield in its coverage.

The consolidation move, urged by United Community Services which disperses funds for programs like Girl Scouting and already approved by boards of directors of both councils, follows a trend that already has brought a dozen similar moves in the national Girl Scout organization.

It also follows an unsuccessful attempt a year ago to consolidate all five Girl Scout councils in the metropolitan Detroit area.

At that time, after a year and a half of study, a consolidation plan was put to vote in the two councils now in-

voluted and also the Huron Valley, North Oakland, and Otsikita (Macomb County) councils. Huron Valley includes part of Westland as well Plymouth and Canton.

The plan was approved then by the Detroit and South Oakland councils and rejected by the other three. The two interested in consolidation then began working on the plan that will be voted next month.

BETTER USE of resources and better programming for changing needs were cited as reasons for the move by leaders of both councils and the national Girl Scout organization. All mentioned rising costs, declining membership because of a lower birth rate, and changes in volunteer leadership availability. "It behooves us to look at how we can make good use of community dollars and still serve girls in the future, even if they are fewer in number," said Jean Wayman, executive director of the Metropolitan Detroit Council. "It's something we have to come to grips with sooner or later," noted Virginia Dethloff of Southfield, president of the South Oakland Council.

Mary Birch, New York center director who came to Detroit this week for

an informational meeting with delegates to the Metropolitan Detroit council, called the consolidation "a very positive move because we can't operate in the '80s as we did in the '50s."

"We just need to behave differently if we are to serve girls' future needs," she added.

MISS WAYMAN mentioned cookie sales and media time as two good reasons for following United Community Services' recommendation for consolidation in the use of funds.

"The various councils hold cookie sales at different times, and there are different prices and different makers," she said. "But this just confuses the public. People just want to buy Girl Scout cookies and not worry about which council is involved."

"Similarly, there's just so much television time and the media people think of Girl Scouts and not separate councils."

Leaders agreed changes will result from the move and Beverlee Budden of Dearborn, president of the Metropolitan Detroit council, suggested that was the reason other councils had rejected it earlier.

"Our council covers both the city and the suburban areas and I think some other councils feel we have problems because of this," she said. "They are strictly suburban. We are financially sound, though."

Miss Wayman commended the two councils involved in the coming vote for their unanimous endorsement of the move.

"I think it is to their credit that they are looking toward the future, although change is difficult for these people too," she said.

TO MAKE SURE delegates are knowledgeable about the proposed consolidation, the Metropolitan council sponsored a meeting with Ms. Birch for its 264 delegates Tuesday night and South Oakland is bringing its 121 delegates to a series of three sessions.

Joyce Picuch of West Bloomfield and Darlene Knight of Farmington are doing the presentations for these meetings.

When the voting takes place, the

Metropolitan delegates will meet at Botsford in the South Oakland delegates in the Lathrup city hall.

"We have telephone communications set up so we will know how it goes," Miss Wayman said.

For approval, each council must have a majority plus one favoring consolidation.

If approved, it will be implemented in stages beginning this spring.

A majority of delegates in both councils were reported participating in the informational meetings. Leaders in

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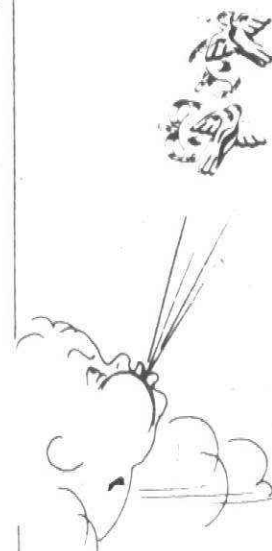
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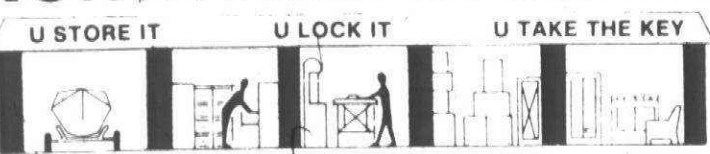
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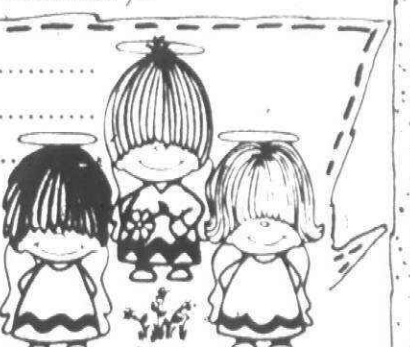
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# Mother Waddles feeds the hungry

"I feel God doesn't come out of the sky," said Mother Charleszetta Waddles in a talk at Madonna College. "He has to work through people. We are not only here to pray, but to present our bodies as a living sacrifice to help those on earth."

The organizer of a women's "prayer band," formed many years ago to give food to the hungry, came during Black Awareness Month to a Madonna class studying social work with the reminder that the hungry are always with us.

Also on the program was Roy Williams, president of the Detroit Urban League, one of 116 such organizations across the country.

The economic gap between black and white was on his mind. He said it is widening and "we still have a long way to go."

Mother Waddles left school at 12 to go to work. Her father died and her mother had heart trouble. She worked in a Jewish home. Because the woman she worked for was kind and understanding she "found love is not black or white." She married the first time at 14, eventually had 10 children and was on ADC (Aid to Dependent Children). "Then I married off the welfare rolls," she said.

She met her husband while selling beef barbecue to raise money for her church. "Along came a man," she said. "He was about three sheets to the wind. God gave me a good turn. That man married me and my children, and gave me a chance to become Mother Waddles. That man allowed me to do unto others, to operate the Perpetual Mission without salary."

NO LONGER PART of the problem, she hoped "to become part of the solution." She said: "I formed a prayer band of women. We started saving canned food from our pantries. It began in my house."

The project grew into the Mother Waddles Perpetual Mission, now at 10455 Shoemaker on the east side of Detroit.

"When we started we gave out mostly food and clothing," she recalled. "Now we're into everything, such as legal and medical counseling. We have our own social work department. We deliver emergency food to homes."

"We serve an evening meal seven days a week between 4-7 p.m. for 35 cents. It includes meat, two vegetables, hot corn bread, whatever the Lord gives. We feed from 50 to 75 people each time, although it increases in times of layoffs."

The mission, she added, is not funded by any government groups, but through donations. It is non-denominational and staffed by volunteers, "who help others because they have been in the wilderness."

Mother Waddles said the Wayne County Department of Social Services sends classes to hear her tell about the mission services. She described herself as "a born-again Christian who wants to demonstrate by her actions that she is living the word."

She added: "I'm just loving the hell out of folks." She believes "what you send out will come back to you."

The mission accepts donations. "Anything," said Mother Waddles. "Believe it or not, I once had some caskets given to me, and I found something to do with them." They made some useful shelves, she remembered.

Those interested in contributing food, clothing or even a potty chair currently needed by an ill adult, can call the mission at 571-1304.

Responding to a question about whether she gets so busy with her work that she becomes insensitive, Mother Waddles declared "you can't run a program and get insensitive."

"People's needs keep you on your toes," she added. "If it's not one thing, it's another."

The speaker, who told her audience she has been "black for 67 years," also said her lot has been "a fantastic life — a good husband, 10 children, all living, 33 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren."

THE MESSAGE of the president of the Detroit Urban League was that the overall situation of blacks in this state is worse than last year.

"A huge population of the black population is still in need," said Roy Williams, "and that population is greater than last year."

He pointed to the situation in higher education as one of the continuing problems of blacks.

"Over the last 20 years about 20 percent of the black community began college," he pointed out. "But only 6 percent were able to complete their education. There is the same percentage today as 15-20 years ago."

He added that only 2 percent of black males, but 5 percent of black females, earn bachelor degrees.

He indicated that it costs about \$13,000 a year to live in the black community, "but all they have to do that existing on is \$7,000-\$8,000 a year." He added that if it takes that much, the economic gap has widened.

WILLIAMS DESCRIBED the Urban League as a civil rights, social worker, advocacy oriented organization. He said some assume that it is for "bourgeois black," but that is not necessarily the case.

"We try to get into board rooms to ask for answers, to show them when they're wrong and we need a change," he commented. The organization provides housing and nutrition counseling, works for quality of education and maintains two scholarship funds. It also runs two street academies at which high school dropouts can continue their education and pass their high school equivalency exam (GED). A few of the students from these store-front schools have gone on to get degrees from Detroit area colleges, Williams said.

The organization is funded by \$500,000 annually from the United Foundation and \$750,000 from federal, state and local agencies.

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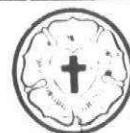

### Crazy rackets for love game

Lots of wind. Quick wrists. Sure strokes. Steady eyes. Mostly love. You can score with your offspring by suggesting this easy-to-prepare project.

All that's needed is a balloon, two wire coat hangers, and a discarded pair of pantyhose. By pushing and pulling, the wire hanger can be shaped into a circle. Squeeze the hook together to form a small handle. Now cut off the pantyhose near the top of each leg.

Fit the hanger into the leg, circle first, handle last, until it reaches the toe portion of the hose and covers the hanger completely. Don't worry about changing the shape of the circle, it will squash slightly giving each one it's own individual style.

Some pantyhose will be left dangling at the handle. This should be wrapped around the handle and tucked in providing protection for tender hands, a good grip and a secure racket. Encourage your child to do most of this project, it's easy and good for developing self-confidence and independence.

BECAUSE THIS toy is so lightweight, it can be used indoors without much fear of damage to child, home or equipment. Rainy days and vacation days are good times to pull out this active activity. It is also good for the child who is nearly recovered from sickness and is too ill to go to school, but no longer willing to sit quietly at home.

Alone, with two, or with as many as have these crazy rackets, this game is fun. A balloon completes the gear and then play can begin. Different size balloons cause slight variations in the game. Basically, the

game is played by throwing the balloon into the air. The idea is to keep it up, or bat it back and forth, or guide it to some goal by using the rackets.

THE EXACT rules are left strictly and entirely up to the participants, allowing for great inventiveness. Rules can also be changed at the start of a game or even during the play — as often as is agreed upon by the players — a real plus in our day of games whose rigid rules take longer to tread than the game takes to play.

In establishing the rules, very

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# Here's the latest for fitness

Here is a round-up of information from the world of medicine, physical fitness and food, consolidated from a variety of experts and news sources involved in the world of obesity and fitness.

• The elusive definition of "junk food" is not so elusive anymore. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has finally defined the term as "a food of minimum nutritional value; i.e., a 100 calorie portion containing less than 5 percent of the recommended daily allowance of any one of the eight basic nutrients."

The problem with this definition (as I see it) is that one must now try to analyze the particular junk food one is eating.

He must now determine which one of the eight food categories is involved in a particular product, what is the recommended daily allowance for that food category, and then whether it contains less than 5 percent of same.

This is still too complicated for the average American eating the stuff — especially teens and small children.

Do you suppose the federal government will ever learn to talk in terms which are easily understood?

• What has happened to frozen yogurt? According to food industry source, while the product is still on the market, the penetration into the market has taken a marked decrease. Reasons given include the fact that the true yogurt flavor can't be appreciated when the product is frozen, and also that — can you believe this one — it was too sweet. One industry source said, "The trend is away from sweet products..." Where was I when the lights went out on this one?

• First the bad news: Heart attacks and strokes are still the major killer diseases of our society. Now the good news: according to the Harvard Medical School, the past five years has shown a definite documented decrease in the death rate from these two diseases.

Arteriosclerosis is the main

cause of heart attack and stroke. Did you know that the process which leads to this condition, atherosclerosis, means, when translated literally from the Greek, "soft, fatty, gruel-like." It sounds so sickening it should make us all think about the fatty substances we eat.

• Two studies have recently been completed relating to women, obesity and its effect on their reproductive cycles and organs. Dr. Arthur Hartz, professor of digestive medicine, found a correlation between overweight women and irregular menstrual cycles.

In a study based on questionnaires of 26,638 women, he found women who were more than 30 pounds overweight were more likely to have a cycle greater than 36 days than those who were not overweight.

In a different study, findings show that extremes of body fat (too much or too little) can be responsible for infertility. The exact rea-

sons are not known, but it is known that since fat tissue is responsible, in part, for estrogen production that it has something to do with changes in female hormones. Returning the obese or underweight female to normal conditions can reverse the infertile condition.

• Dr. Jimmy Johnson, executive director of The Association of Physical Fitness Centers, reports on the benefits exercise can bring.

After following a program of active exercise for a few months," he tells us, "many people report experiencing a new sense of well-being and less fatigue. Other say the renewed sense of vitality has helped them control habits such as smoking and overeating."

Some facts and figures compiled by that same organization tell us: 45 percent of American adults never engage in physical activity for exercise. That is, they don't do anything beyond what is required of them. And, medical experts on the problem of obesity recently estimated that one-half of all American adults are overweight and that one-third of them are obese, which they defined as being overweight to the point that it constitutes a health risk.

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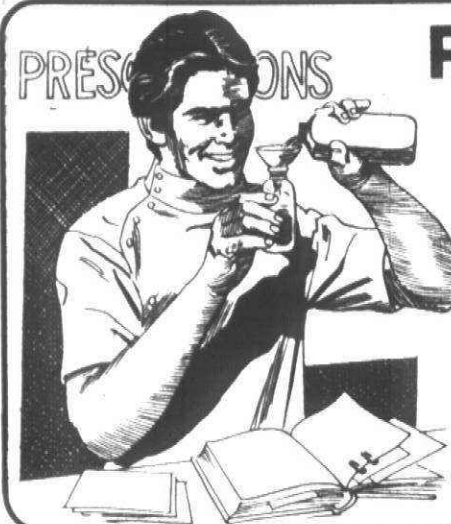
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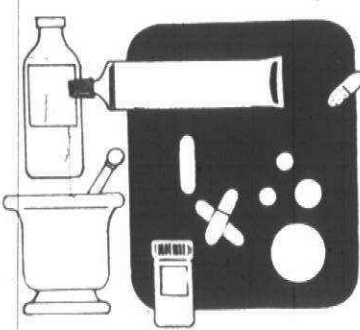
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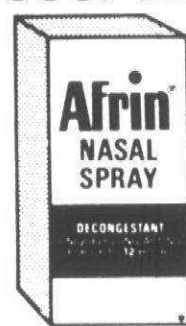
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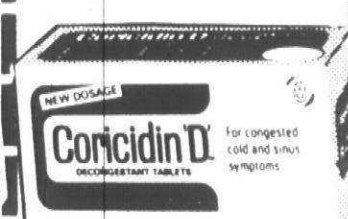
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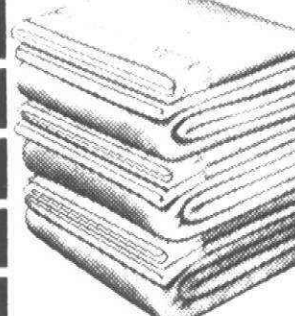
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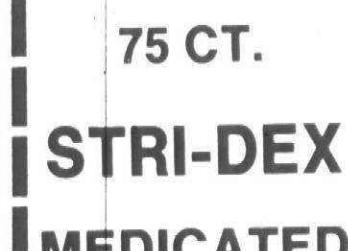
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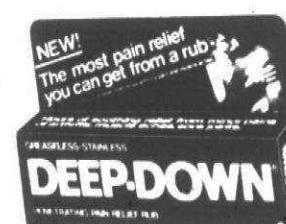

## Fiddlers' club draws hundreds to old-time folk music revivals

By TIM RICHARD

"We held a dance to locate musicians and people asked, 'Hey, who's holding this?' And I said, 'Um — er — the Original Michigan Fiddlers Association.'"

Robert M. Fleck tells that story about how he and Jane Allison co-founded a breezy, informal group while doing research on fiddling in Michigan.

"We want to meet old-time style musicians, callers and dancers and provide an opportunity for them to learn new tunes," said Fleck.

Today the Original Michigan Fiddlers Association has about 900 members. Membership is defined as subscribing to a quarterly newsletter and showing up at admission-free jamborees.

SINCE OMFA was "founded" in 1976, more than three dozen gatherings have been held around the state.

A jam session is scheduled for 6-11 p.m. Saturday, March 15 in the fire hall at Palmyra, a Lenawee County village six miles southeast of Adrian.

A local jamboree will be held April 26 in Vassar, a Tuscola County town almost due east of Saginaw.

"Our members come from all over the state, mostly outside the major urban metropolises," said Fleck. "But

some come from around the 'burbs.'"

Among them are Charles Gadd, a violin maker and fiddler from Orchard Lake; Jake and Pat Glover, banjo picker and fiddler from Canton; Gene Boyd, banjo player from Westland; fiddler Anita Dolen and square dance caller Roy Faigle, both of Redford Township; and Bob Ewald, banjo and guitar player from Livonia.

A RECENT happening in Ypsilanti's Workmen's Hall drew over 300 persons and 40 participating musicians, half of them fiddlers, said Fleck.

A jamboree ran all afternoon and a square dance was held in the evening. Welcome were all such non-electric instruments as fiddles, banjos, guitars, mandolins and dulcimers.

"Young people got tired of rock and roll," Fleck says in explaining the movement's strength. "It was a spinoff of the alternative lifestyles of the 1960s and '70s."

Michigan has a strong tradition of such music. For instance, Henry Ford I sponsored a radio program of fiddle and square dance music in the 1940s.

Scholars say Michigan was a fertile source of folk songs because its economy attracted such diverse groups —

## Okie Merle Haggard says his neck ain't so red

We don't smoke marijuana in Muskogee. We don't take our trips on LSD.

Merle Haggard, the singer who became the darling of the redneck camp in 1969 with his tune "Okie from Muskogee," now says the whole thing started out as a joke.

"I was speaking of a middle-class American, but not necessarily me," he said in one of his few recent interviews. "And this song was written on behalf of those who were kind of satisfied with the way things were at the time. I don't necessarily share all those sentiments."

"I didn't put down smoking grass. Didn't say I didn't smoke it myself."

HAGGARD IS this weekend's performer at the Michigan Opry, on stage at 7 and 10 p.m. Saturday at the State Wayne Theater, Michigan Avenue at Wayne Road. Tickets are \$12.50 and \$10, available at the box office or by calling 721-2100.

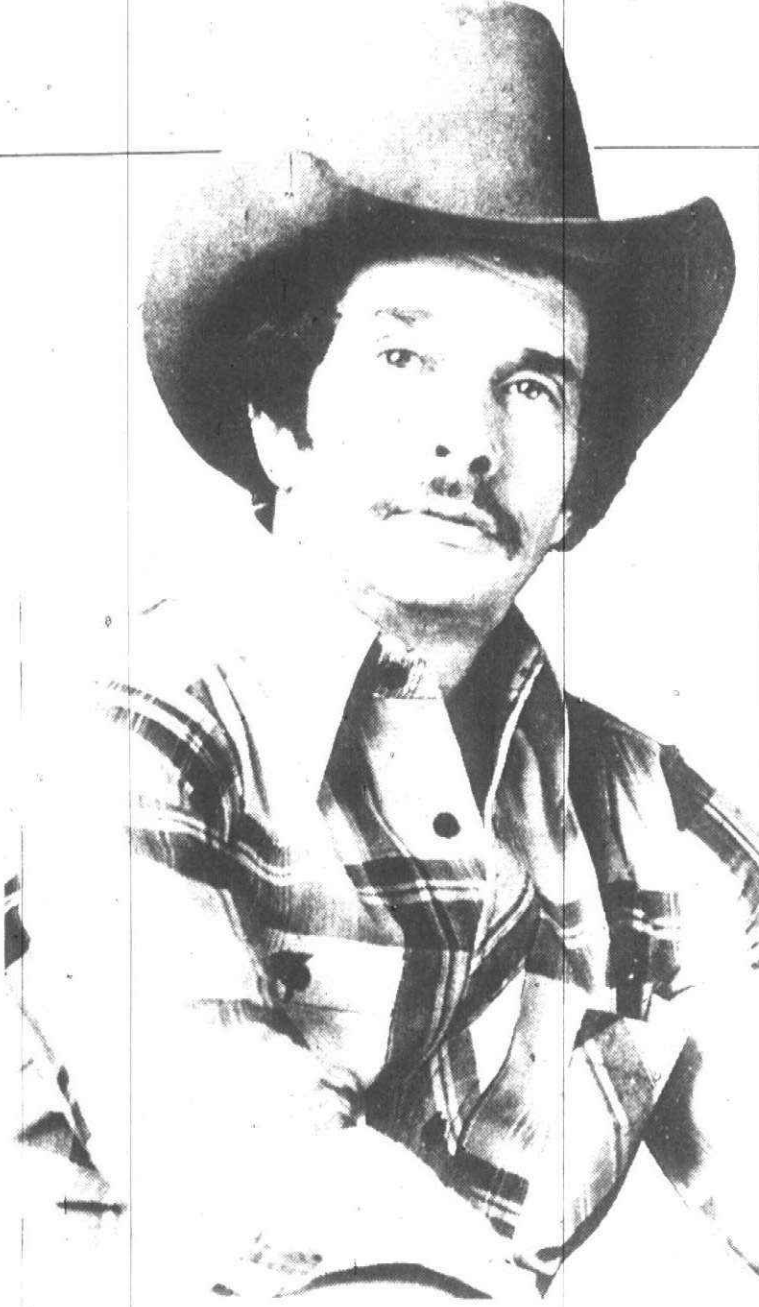
Previous acts in the Opry series, now two shows old, have been marked by an enthusiastic audience heavy on cowboy hats and a penchant for a good time. The opening night act — Johnny Paycheck — came complete with a welcome from the mayor of Wayne, who suggested that anyone having problems with the Wayne police department give the mayor a call.

Opry organizers have refined their act a bit since that opening night. Tickets are no longer being sold as general admission, so a crowd doesn't have to wait out in the cold to get in. And Deano Day, the WCXI disc jockey, won't be continuing as the regular emcee after his first-night antics of sexist innuendo offended many in the audience.

Merle Haggard, in fact, should provide an act similar to Paycheck's opener. Both are practitioners of the "outlaw" school of country music, and both are known for their lyrics leaning on social issues.

Haggard's works include, "They're Tearin' the Labor Camps Down," about migrant workers, and "Irma Jackson," about the problems of an interracial love affair.

Record promoters paint Haggard as an honest



character who grew up the hard way, triumphing over his personal setbacks to reach success — a guy who was born in a boxcar and grew up amid cardboard shacks on dirt farms. At the age of 20, he was arrested trying to rob a restaurant and found with a check machine from a previous robbery; that one got him 1-15 in San Quentin prison, his high school equivalency diploma and an experience he says he'd never trade.

"You learn about authority when it's abused. A lot of the convicts are better people than the guards," he says.

Haggard says he was thrust into an untrue light as the darling of the flag wavers from the popularity of "Okie from Muskogee." But, as is perhaps the main appeal of country music in general, Haggard still sticks up for the plain folks of the world.

"I try to write about the things that affect people," he says, "and at the same time it reflects every way I feel, one way or the other."

## At 82, she still sings the blues

Sippie Wallace has vivid memories of her life with jazz powerhouses Louis Armstrong, King Oliver, Johnny Dodds, Bessie Smith, Clarence Williams and Ma Rainey.

And she still sings, at age 82, with the power and clarity that marked her blues vocals of the 1920s, when she was part of the birth of blues.

Now, Yvonne Gill-Davis, owner of Tweeny's restaurant in Birmingham, is bringing Sippie Wallace to midtown Birmingham, of all places.

"I got really excited about Sippie when I read about her in the newspaper," Ms. Gill-Davis said. "I thought what a great thing to bring an older blues singer with a Detroit background to a young people's restaurant in the suburbs. I love listening to the blues from that period."

Tweeny's restaurant will present Sippie Wallace backed by four members of the Easy Street Jazz Band at 9:30 and 11:15 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

SIPPIE WALLACE is just as thrilled by this engagement. It will be different from the concerts she has performed in the last several years since Ron Harwood brought her out of relative obscurity.

"Ronnie told me I was a cabaret singer," she said just before rehearsal

at Harwood's Farmington Hills home recently. "I did some cabaret 30 years ago."

The relationship between Harwood and the elderly black blues singer resembles that of mother and son. Harwood is protective and he idolizes Ms. Wallace's blues-singing ability.

During the last 15 years, he has interviewed her for a book he plans to write. He has helped guide her, and researched records and recording information.

His most prized possession is a fragile 78 record on the Okeh label from 1923. That was Sippie's first record.

Harwood screens prospective interviewers carefully and chooses where and how she will work. She obviously loves him and this is evident in her scolding of him like a naughty child.

"RONNIE, WHY didn't you tell me someone was going to take my picture? I'm not dressed for that," she complains.

Long before Sippie Wallace arrived for the rehearsal with her quartet (pianist James Dapogny, clarinetist Peter Ferran, trombonist Bob Smith and guile

trappers, miners, sailors, lumbermen and unionized industrial workers, many of the latter from Appalachia.

"Many persons learned old-time music from their grandparents," said Fleck. "Some are extremely talented."

ON WEEKDAYS, Fleck is a writer and producer of films and videotapes.

A graduate of Wayne State University's Monteith College, he got a degree in film and writing. He has made films on medium duty gas engine applications for Chevrolet, training procedures for the Mid-Michigan Law Enforcement Association and how to sell lumber for Wickes.

"I started playing classical violin at 9, but by the time I got to college I discovered fiddle and guitars," Fleck said. "Then I discovered fiddle music and learned to play by ear."

Through video work he met Ms. Allison, who edits videotape for commercials and plays the button accordion.

Ms. Allison brings more than musical and technical skills to the project. Raised in Hawaii speaking pidgin English, she came to Michigan State University to learn standard English and cultural communications.

Fleck concocted an idea for a documentary on old-time music and suggested it to Ms. Allison.

The first result was "Spring Meeting," a 17-minute film on the dulcimer, which looks like a horizontal harp and is played with small hammers. The film is available from Hillsdale Educational Publishers in Hillsdale.

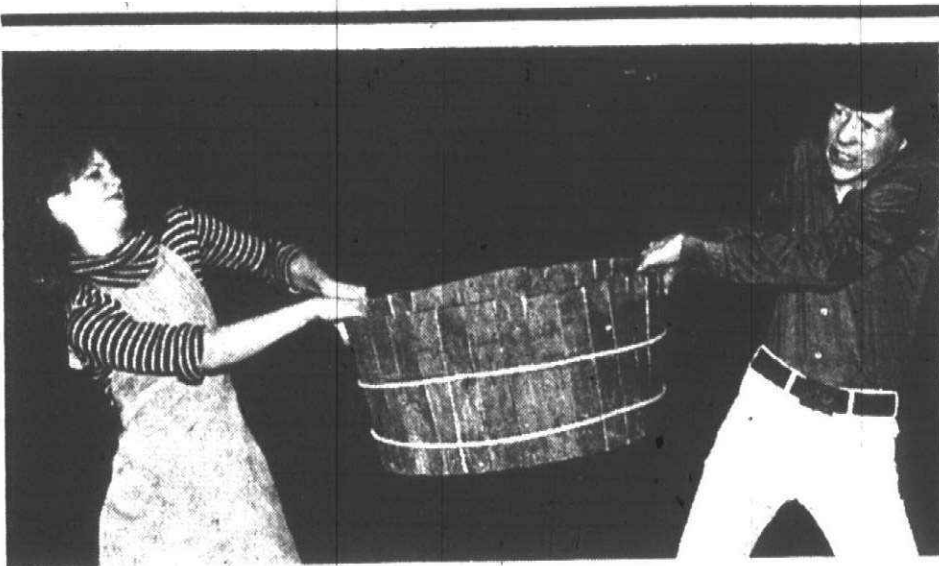
FLECK AND Ms. Allison are doing a film on fiddling with grants from the Michigan Council for the Arts, National Endowment for the Arts and Ford Motor Co. Fund. The grants cover only production costs — not their research or script writing.

Out of their research grew the Original Michigan Fiddlers' Association, which sponsors about four events a year in its own name. One subscriber by sending \$8 to OMFA Quarterly Newsletter, Box 21173, Detroit 48221.

Members also organize their own jam sessions, such as the forthcoming ones at Palmyra and Vassar.

Folk music today has many sources. Chief are English and Scotch ballads, narrative songs with many verses. Square dancing is patterned after English rural jigs (known in the music of Johann Sebastian Bach as gigues).

In America, blacks influenced folk music, and the result, said Fleck, was bluegrass.

# Mozart meets the Yukon Sunday

A long-time member of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra will step to center stage as soloist in the orchestra's fifth concert of the season at 4 p.m. Sunday in Plymouth-Salem High School, Joy west of Canton Center Road.

John Mohler, principal clarinetist, will be heard in the Concerto for Clarinet and Orchestra, K. 622, the last concerto Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart wrote before his death at the age of 35.

With guest conductor Johan van der Merwe at the podium, the orchestra will open with Reznicek's "Donna Diana" overture, which middle-aged listeners will recognize as the radio theme of the 1940s radio program "Challenge of the Yukon."

After intermission, the orchestra will be heard in Brahms' "Variations on a Theme by Haydn," Ravel's "Pavane for a Dead Princess" and Britten's "Four Sea Interludes from the opera 'Peter Grimes.'"

**MOHLER, WHO** joined the Plymouth Symphony in 1958, is chairman of the wind and percussion department of the University of Michigan School of Music, celebrating its centennial this year.

He has been a soloist with the United States Marine Band and Orchestra and with the Philadelphia Orchestra. Mohler studied at the Curtis Institute in Philadelphia and is U-M's first recipient of the doctor of musical arts in wind instruments.

The clarinet, now a popular instrument in bands, orchestras and ensembles, was still almost a novelty when Mozart was introduced to it. He wrote several solo parts for it in 1791, the final year of his life, and the concerto is a staple in every top-flight soloist's musical diet.

Van der Merwe, a professor of music at U-M, has studied and conducted in his native South Africa and several European countries. Winner of first prize

in an International Conductors Competition in Liverpool, England, he will be director of the University Orchestra at Interlochen this summer.

Van der Merwe is to return to the National Symphony in Johannesburg in 1981 for a recording and concert series.

During intermission and after the concert, members of the Three Cities Art Club will display and sell their works.

# Boat launch site bill waits for House vote

A bill to restrict public boat launch development in Michigan breezed through the State Senate but has a low priority in the House Conservation Committee.

Senate Bill 8 was sponsored by state Sen. Donald Bishop, R-Rochester, at the urging of constituents in western Oakland County's lakes area. It passed the Senate 34-3 Feb. 27, a vote that surprised even Bishop "in light of previous opposition from the UAW and State Department of Natural Resources."

An aide to Rep. Thomas Anderson, D-Southgate, said, however, many higher priority bills face the conservation committee, which Anderson chairs. Thus, said Bob Garner, the aide, Bishop's bill "will probably die at the end of the session" without being reported out.

Bishop said his bill will allow "local citizens and units of government more input into the development of public access lake sites for fishing and boating."

"In the past, the DNR has made the decisions on its own without sufficient local consultation. This has often times resulted in the overcrowding of lakes, boating accidents, trash dumping and traffic tie-ups, all at the expense of local residents."

**KEITH WILSON**, of DNR's Waterways Commission, said the department holds hearings when requested, but SB 8 would be more restrictive.

It would require local public hearings. In the event a local unit objected to a new boat launch, the state

Natural Resources Commission would be able to develop it only by a two-thirds vote.

Wilson said DNR had three other objections to the Bishop bill:

- The bill provides that if a local road agency believes improvements are necessary to serve the boat launch site, the state would have to pay for them. This would put DNR in the road funding business and be an impediment to developing public boating.

- It sets minimum standards for launches that would "virtually rule out access sites in non-urbanized areas." For example, a site would have to be adjacent to a public road, a standard impossible to meet in much of the outstate area although still possible in Oakland County.

- It tightens standards of boats allowed per acre of lake. It reduces the number of public sector boats that can gain access," he said.

The Southeastern Michigan Bass Association has denounced Bishop's efforts, saying, "Strong lake associations who control their local politicians could and would deprive access to the general public to inland lakes in their area."

**OAKLAND COUNTY** has been relatively successful in stopping boat launch development.

DNR's report for the decade of the 1970s shows no new access sites added in Oakland. DNR district fisheries biologist Ron Spittler said, in the report's section on southeast Michigan fisheries management.

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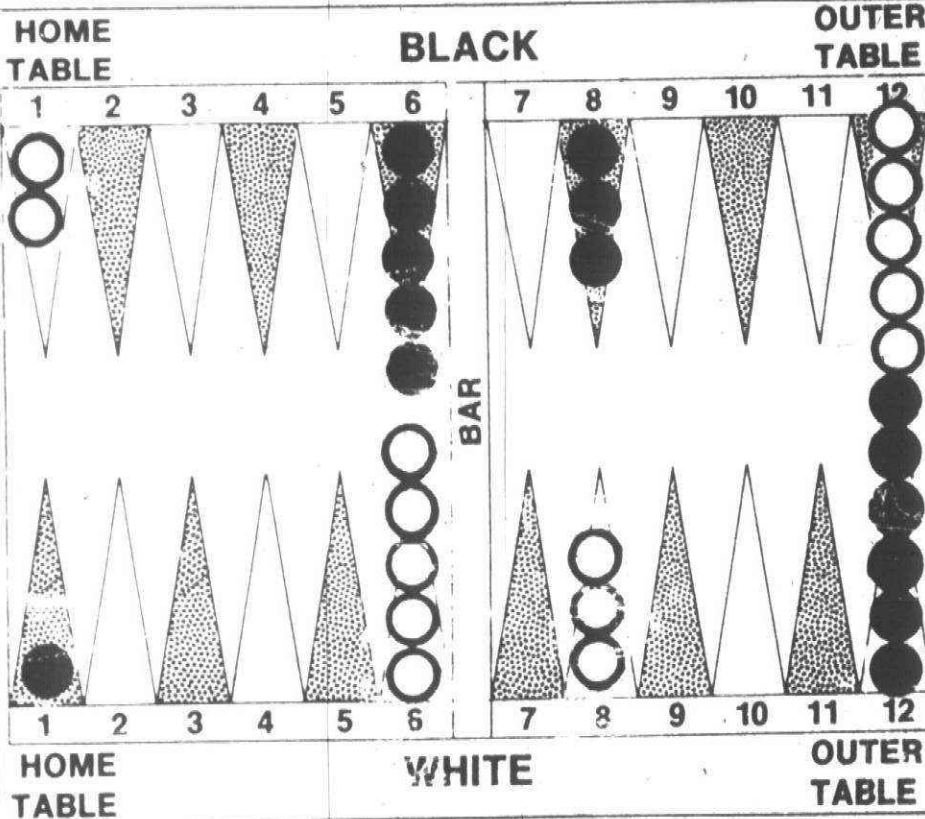
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**TAKING CONTROL**  
Too often during the early part of a game, we allow our opponent uninhibited freedom — freedom to run and freedom to bring in builders (extra or loose checkers purposely planted in the outer table waiting to make key points in the home table). While on a rare occasion you may stop your opponent early, you could limit or restrict his movement — making it difficult for him to move as he wants and forcing him to make awkward plays. If you lose the opening roll, your first move becomes critical. Since you cannot pre-plan a certain strategy, your first move could determine an overall game plan. In the example, black won the opening roll with a six-five and chose to move a back runner (black checker on the 1 point) to the 12 point (mid-point) for safety. White rolls a four-two for his first move. How would you play it? Under normal circumstances, making white's 4 point is a constructive play. But black has one checker back and closing the 4 point will not block or stop black from moving on a strong number on the next roll.

**BEST OVERALL MOVE**  
Naturally, there are several four-two moves. But only one play will allow white total control of the board. By moving a checker from the 1 point to black's 5 point, white controls black's entire outer table. The single checker on the 1 point restricts black from leaving a blot (single checker) in his inner table. White should also bring a checker to the 11 point from black's 12 point. Since white already has checkers bearing in both his home and outer tables, the extra builder will further inhibit black from running and will also serve in covering the 5 point. Black could roll double ones, threes or three-one, but the odds (four out of 36) are not severe and white is in a much more flexible position. The concept of control is important to understand.

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## An early celebration of St. Patrick's Day

If you feel like celebrating St. Patrick's Day a little early this year, join the Irish Fleadh from 2-5 p.m. Sunday at the International Institute in Detroit. And you don't even have to be Irish.

Take Ed Marmon, for instance. Marmon will be on hand for the Fleadh, which is Gaelic for celebration, because he is head librarian and co-founder of the Gaelic League's library. But if Marmon doesn't sound like an Irish name to you, that's because it isn't.

Marmon and Tom Kelley, who both work for the Wayne-Westland schools, started the collection about three years ago.

"We started the thing after drinking too many pints one night. Don't print that," said Marmon, who says he's adopted an affinity for Ireland.

"We adopted each other," he said.

"I've been there three times. I've got lots of friends there."

Marmon's Irish library, housed at the Gaelic League in Detroit, includes over 500 volumes plus films, slides and music. Marmon also has begun an oral history project, taping interviews with people knowledgeable on the subject.

Marmon, who is still building the collection, said the library could use more donations — of money and materials. It's open Tuesday nights and by appointment.

But besides Marmon, the Sunday Fleadh will feature Irish dancers, historic Irish musical instruments and refreshments.

Cost of the afternoon is \$5 including refreshments other than Irish coffee. Reservations are required by calling the institute at 871-8600.

tarist Rod McDonald, Harwood had a tape chronicling her best performances of the last 15 years.

"Me and Hociel (her sister) wrote that one," she said as her ears perk up to a tune in the background. "That woman has the three V's," she said.

"Vim, vigor and vitality."

She giggles at the sound of her own added little teaser in another song on the tape. She originally recorded "Tain't Nobody Home But Me" in 1929 with jazz clarinetist Johnny Dodds.

"MY BROTHER, HE knew all of them. When I went to make my first record in New York City, they gave me Louis Armstrong and Eddie Heywood (pianist).

"I'd record six records at a time. When I would come to New York after that, there would be a gang of songs in the office for me to sing. The writer

and the company would pay me to sing the songs.

"They'd ask me, 'Sippie, who do you want this time?' I could pick anyone. I was goin' to use Armstrong's wife, Miss Lil (Lillian Hardin, New Orleans pianist), but me and she had a fuss. I don't know, maybe she thought I was going toward Louis, I don't know."

Ms. Wallace knew several other singers considered important blues singers during the years when the classic blues singers were big record sellers.

"There was Butterbeans and Susie (Jodie and Susie Edwards), Sara Martin and Ma Rainey," she said.

"Ma was older than me. We were all friends. My brother had put them on records — you know Butterbeans and Ma. But, I wanted to be with Susie (Edwards). They couldn't put two big stars on the same billing though. It was too heavy."

"Susie made me go on my own. I did tent shows all through Texas."

THE TENT SHOWS, she said, were like theaters. Different singers would come to a tent show in some small town for a week.

"You had to change your songs every night. People, the same people, would come back each night to hear you."

To please her husband, she moved to Detroit around 1929.

"I ain't never liked it here. Never could stand Detroit," she said.

But she stayed. And aside from singing gospel music and playing her piano in her Detroit church, she was away from commercial music from 1929 to 1965, when the teenaged blues lover Harwood looked her name up in the Detroit phone book and persuaded her to sing the blues again in public.

At Tweeny's, she'll do cabaret: "I'll be going around to tables with a microphone and do a little talking."

HARWOOD TELLS a story about her

songs. "We went to see 'Ain't Misbehavin', and after the show Sippie said they didn't do 'Squeeze Me' right. She said that Fats (Waller) had taught her that song and the words were too dirty to sing any more. But when the cast for 'Ain't Misbehavin' comes to hear her perform at Tweeny's she's going to surprise them by singing the real words."

But it's the gospel and religious songs that have been important to her during the last four of five decades.

"Stand By Me," that's my special song," the singer says in slow motion, "because I've been so sick." She had a stroke in 1970.

"God's been behind me. Course, you got to do anything you can do. I can play for church. I do that. In order to keep my hands active, I can play the piano. I been serving God's kingdom in that way. But, without God, you can't do nothing."

## Design tricks can set a mood for any home

First impressions of a dwelling mean as much as first impressions of people. Why do you enjoy visiting one friend's house more than another's? A single visit is enough sometimes to register the idea that "this is a place someone cares about."

Later, when you analyze your reactions, you will discover that certain rules of decoration have been followed, consciously or by instinct. Chances are the homes you find most pleasant are a combination of shrewd planning and happy coincidence.

The first of these — the planning — you must supply yourself. The incidental, sometimes surprising touches will follow naturally from the beginning with careful planning combined with your most precious possessions and preferences of individual members of the family.

Try to view your house objectively. Pretend you don't live there. Enter the door as a stranger. What is the first impression? If you are fortunate in having an entrance hall, or at least a space where a pocket-size vestibule can be devised, it can strike the desired note at once. Furthermore, it should do so.

UNLESS A HOUSE or apartment is very large and grand, calling for a formal, dramatic treatment at the entrance, it is well to start your decorative scheme at the front door with a floor covering that continues as far as the eye can see.

Wallcoverings should be correlated from this focal point, although you will want them to vary somewhat as the eye surveys the interior. Standing just inside the entrance, you might ask yourself questions. Are the rooms I see related to each other? Does one lead logically to the next? Do they look inviting?

It is mostly a matter of color. You are ready, now, for a family conference. The chief decision is a color, or a color scheme — something to which the adults of the family will respond. Several factors have to be considered — the exposure of the rooms, the wear and tear in them, the already existing furnishings that somewhat set the pace.

ARE YOU A warm family or a cool one? Will you be happier with yellows or with blues or greens? First you should get color chips from the paint store and study various new combinations you might choose. The color note sounded at the entrance is like a fanfare of trumpets that should sound throughout the house.

The greatest harmonizers of all are color and pattern, and they exist in their most persuasive form in wallpaper and wall coverings. There are decorating tricks you should know about and can use in more than one room of the house.

TO RAISE A ceiling, keep it light. Pale colors, either textures or small patterns, will make a ceiling recede.

If you use strong verticals on the walls, stripes or any patterns that definitely thrust upwards, they carry the eye with them.

Place low furniture strategically, so that the space between it and the ceiling will appear greater.

To lower a ceiling, call attention to it. An eye-catching pattern, whether dark or bright in color, brings a ceiling nearer.

To lower a ceiling, use horizontal patterns on the walls. Murals often serve the same purpose.

Break the height of the wall with a dado or a chair rail, wallpaper above it.

TO MAKE small rooms seem spacious, use cool, receding colors in open patterns on light grounds. Textures alone won't do the trick. Perspective must be created by suggesting depth.

Combine two or more wallcoverings, a mural or pattern on one wall, and texture on another, it will give the effect of different planes.

TO MAKE BARE rooms seem furnished, don't be afraid to use big, bold patterns. These may be patterns from any category, and the motifs can be as bright and the grounds as dark as desired.

To break up the walls into panels is architectural trickery, and well handled it is the classic solution to any wall problem.

TO WIDEN a narrow room, use a horizontal pattern on one short, unbroken wall, or on walls at opposite ends of the room. They will literally push the other walls apart.

To select any color or pattern, make certain of the exposure of the room where it will be used. Warm colors obviously affect a cold room and light colors brighten dark ones.

See your colors under both artificial light and natural daylight, then decide under which conditions you will be seeing it.
