Poor health may cause treasurer to resign job

Canton Treasurer Jim Donahue has been handed a warning: slow down at work or risk dying on the job.

"My doctor said I'll kill myself if I don't slow down," said Donahue, 32, who'll probably announce his resignation this week. "I'm certainly not happy about the situation. But there's nothing in this world I'll sacrifice my health for."

Donahue expects to make his decision this Thursday after visiting his doctor and learning the results of medical tests. He has already been diagnosed for mononucleosis, an upper respiratory infection, and the beginning stages of an ulcer.

HE SAID his resignation would not take effect until after the fate of Canton's proposed zoning ordinance is decided. The township board will consider the ordinance at a special meeting Thursday.

Supervisor Noel Culbert said he would consider recommending Deputy Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz to fill the remainder of Donahue's term, which expires next November. The township board holds the power to appoint replacements.

Mrs. Falkiewicz resigned from the deputy treasurer's job last month because of frustrations with inadequate staffing in the department. She has continued to work, however, because of Donahue's poor health.

The treasurer notified the township board of his possible plans last week.

Donahue said his doctor has attributed his health problems to "doing too much and being under too much stress."

He works as general manager of a family-owned business in addition to his job as part-time township treasurer.

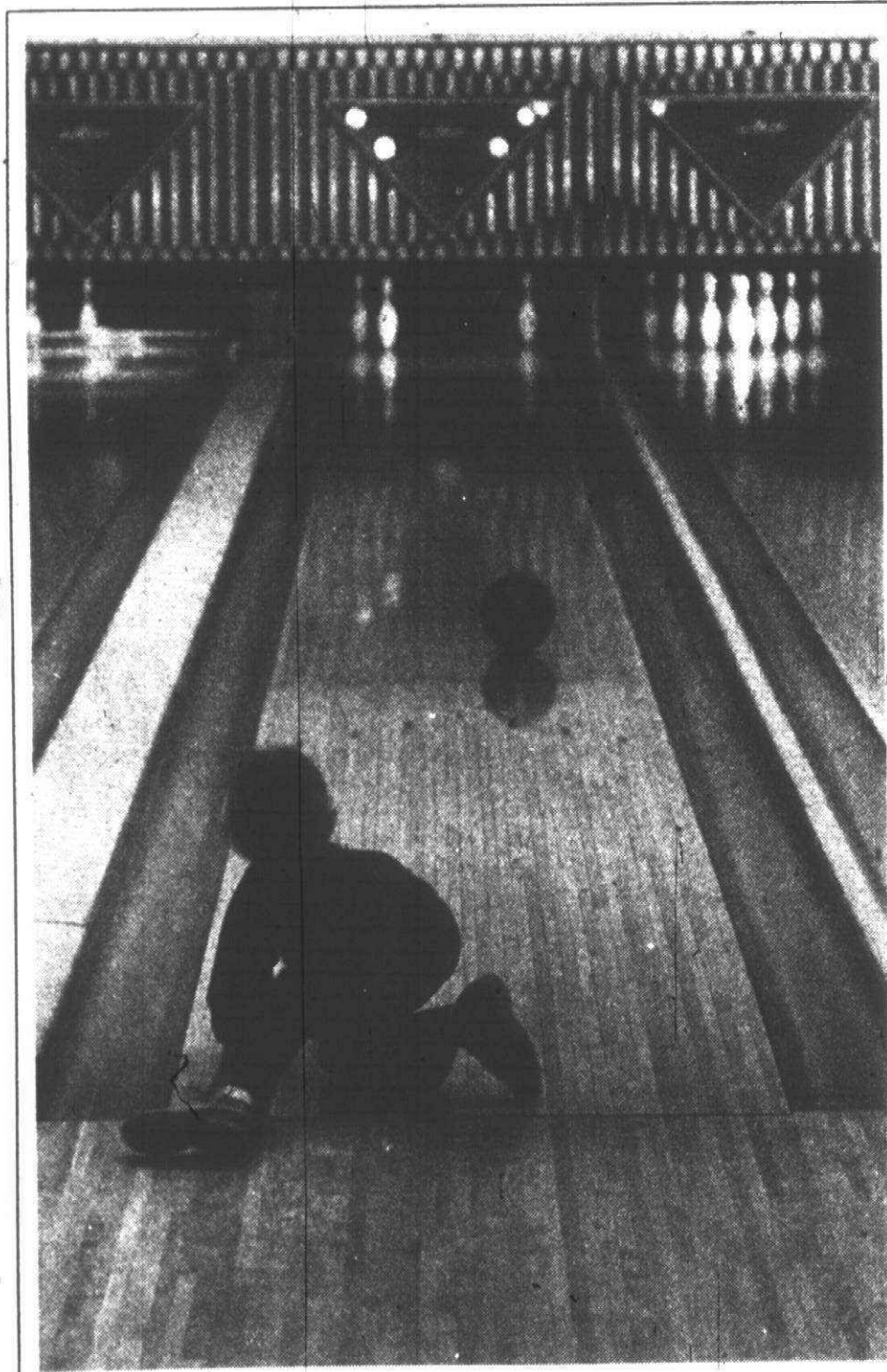

Four youths charged

Pizzeria is held up

Four teenagers, including two from Plymouth, have been arrested for the March 5 armed robbery of a Dino's Pizzeria in Canton Township.

The arrests were made after one of the youths, Randy Smith, 17, of Plymouth, reported to Canton police that his 1971 Maverick had been stolen.

Police say Smith and his three partners abandoned the car on a dead-end road in the southern part of Canton Township following a road race with police on the night of the robbery.

Charged with one count of armed robbery and a second count of firearm possession in the commission of a felony are Smith, Jeffrey Eschker, 18, of Plymouth; and Eddie Lee Gross, 17, of Wayne.

Police would not release the name of the fourth youth, who is a juvenile. He is awaiting a hearing in Wayne County Juvenile Court.

Smith, Eschker and Gross were arraigned last Thursday before Judge James Garber of the 35th District Court. Lt. Larry Stewart of the Canton Police Department said all three were held in the Wayne County jail on Friday after failing to post a \$50,000 cash bond.

Pretrial examination has been scheduled for March 17 in Garber's court.

According to Stewart, three of the youths entered the Dino's Pizzeria near Lilley and Palmer roads at approximately 11 p.m. March 5, while the fourth teenager waited outside in the car.

The teenagers allegedly pulled a gun on Dino employee Robert Bush and demanded the store's cash. After pocketing \$120, they left the store, police said.

Stewart said police spotted Smith's car near Palmer and Sheldon after responding to Bush's report of a robbery. The car was being driven in a "suspicious manner," and police began to chase the vehicle.

According to Stewart, the four defendants threw a gun, \$111 in cash and the face masks they wore during the robbery out the car window during the chase.

After turning on a dead-end road with police in close pursuit, the four jumped out of the car and escaped across an open field, Stewart said.

Smith called police a few hours later to report his car stolen.

An armed robbery conviction carries a sentence of one year to life in jail. Possessing a firearm in the commission of a felony carries a two- to five-year prison sentence.

Madonna seal gleams in window given by grad

The foyer of Madonna College's administration building is a more colorful place these days because of the senior art project Herbert Wolf presented to his alma mater after graduation.

Catching the sunlight in the airy room is a striking stained glass window, nine feet high and four feet wide, depicting the Madonna seal in brilliantly colored glass from all over the world.

Wolf, who graduated in December, has been interested in stained glass since he watched a master craftsman some years ago in Benton Harbor.

When he picked the big project he would do in his studies with Sr. Mary Angeline, head of the art department, they determined together it would be a stained glass window with the college seal.

"I wanted to make something large," Wolf said, "and I wanted to

give it to the college because it has been a good place to study."

THE WINDOW, created in sections as Wolf worked closely with Sr. Angeline, was begun in October and completed just in time for installation last month.

It utilizes blue glass from Germany, deep amber from France, white pieces from Belgium and blues and greens from different parts of this country to show the emblem of college.

"There is also some red bull's-eye glass that is new on the market," said Wolf, "and Canadian art glass that has a marbled effect. The gem in the center is a cut crystal from Germany."

The soldered-together pieces of glass, the smallest only a quarter of an inch square, picture the symbols

of the Livonia school and its founders, the Felician Sisters.

"THE CREST is based on the Franciscan crest," said Sr. Angeline. "It has a cross and the crossed hands of Christ and St. Francis, superimposed upon the immaculate heart of Mary, which is pierced and has the Host in the center."

That is the Felician emblem, she added. The part of the crest that represents the college is a book and the Latin words "Sapientia Desursum," which mean "wisdom from above."

Wolf said family and friends helped him cover the cost of the gift. "The college was beautifully careful in getting it moved and mounted," he added.

"I got a lot of good experience in making the window," he said. "It was a big project and I really enjoyed it."

Mental health board gets year's funding

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners, hoping to avert a possible state takeover of area mental health services, has approved its full year's share of funding for the Detroit-Wayne County Community Mental Health Board.

County commissioners last week unanimously approved granting the countywide coordinating and monitoring agency \$2 million for the remainder of the 1980 fiscal year.

When it adopted the 1979-80 county budget, the county funded the agency for only 120 days. That \$900,000 appropriation would have expired March 31.

THE MENTAL health board distributes \$40 million in state, federal and county funds to 42 community mental health agencies throughout Wayne County.

According to director Mel Ravitz, services funded "run the whole gamut" from community clinic treatment of the mentally ill to the mentally retarded.

"Our action should tell (Dr. Frank M.) Ochberg (director of the Michigan Department of Mental

Health) we are prepared to assume our share of responsibility," said Commissioner Thomas Pressnell, D-Garden City, chairman of the 12-person mental health board. The county board appoints half of the board and Detroit Mayor Coleman Young appoints the other half.

Ochberg had threatened to cut the state's \$30 million share of the mental health board budget on April 1, in part because the county had not met its obligation.

Ochberg had also proposed to eliminate the board and have the state administer all the county community mental health programs.

Last month, Michigan Attorney General Frank Kelley ruled that the state couldn't, unilaterally take over the board's operation, but could cut funding if the county didn't pay its full share.

THE COMMISSIONERS approved a transfer of \$2 million from the county's budget for mental health care in state-run institutions, an action that may not resolve the problem.

The state requires the county to pay 10 percent of a county resident's care in state-run mental hospitals. It has been estimated the county owes the state some \$7 million.

At this time, the Metropolitan Club is under contract with a private promoter to present a country western show. The promoter is selling advertising space for the show's yearbook as well as tickets to the show. The show will be held the weekend following the Fall Festival in September.

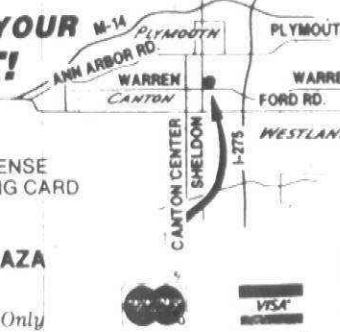

Joyner will seek re-election

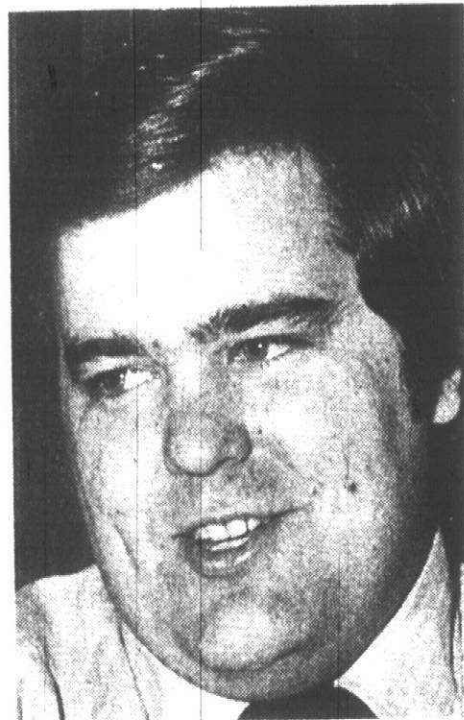
Wayne County Commisior R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, has announced plans to seek re-election in the 27th District.

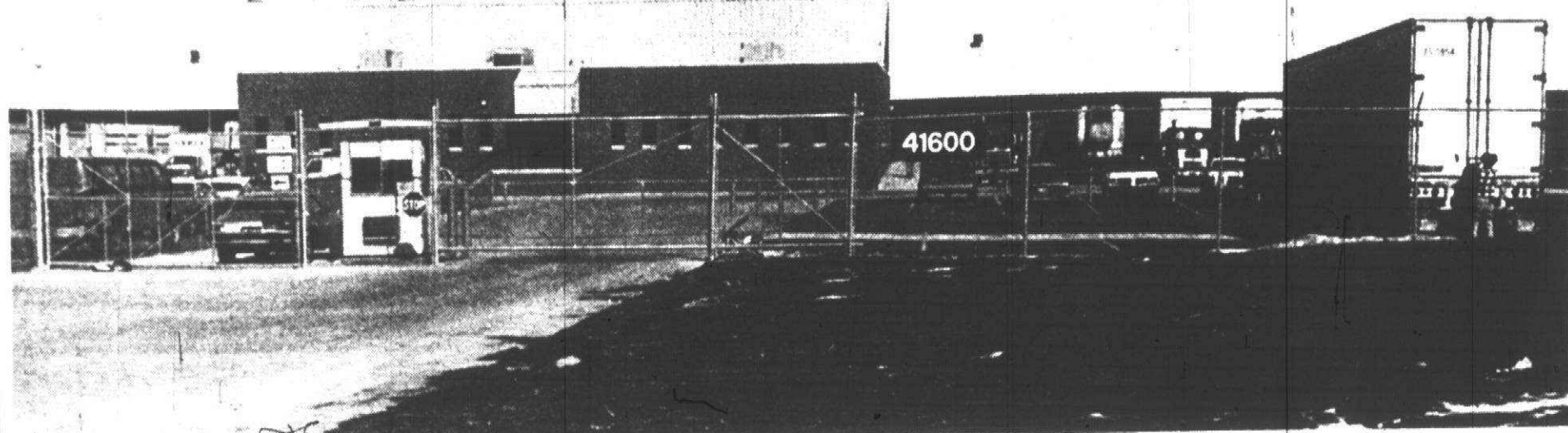

Lawyer leads firm astray on taxes as company bills flood Canton hall

A firm's attempt to avoid paying Michigan sales tax has sent an estimated \$600,000 in the company's unpaid bills to Canton township's accounts-payable department over the last five months.

John Sweet, vice president of the Wisconsin-based Farm House Foods, said the bills continue coming to Canton by mistake because of a company attorney's advice on how to avoid Michigan sales tax payments.

Farm House Foods, a wholesale food distributor, opened their warehouse in Canton last week.

The tax strategy recommended by the Farm House attorney was abandoned weeks ago, Sweet said.

The firm learned that its attorney's advice was based on an erroneous interpretation of Michigan's Economic Development Corporation (EDC) law — the avenue used to finance the warehouse at Van Born and Haggerty.

Mitchell Puksza, an assistant administrator for the Michigan Treasury Department, said the company has cooperated fully with the state and has paid all delinquent sales taxes within the last few weeks.

Canton Police Lt. Larry Stewart estimated the amount of delinquent taxes at \$25,000 — a figure which neither Puksza nor Sweet would deny.

Township police notified the Treasury Department of the tax law violation last month after dropping an investigation into possible fraud.

According to Stewart, the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office labelled the case a civil matter between the state and Farm House Foods.

BUT CANTON OFFICIALS, who received two more company bills totalling \$7,000 last Thursday, are not smiling over what the treasury department calls "a misunderstanding."

They have demanded an explanation before the full township board before considering an application from Farm House Foods for an additional \$500,000 in EDC financing.

The township approved \$4.7 million in EDC bonds two years ago. The unpaid bills began arriving at township hall last October as the warehouse entered the final stages of construction.

Michigan law allows municipalities to establish Economic Development Corporations for purposes of luring industry. Banks sell low-interest bonds through the EDC to companies which have been approved by the municipality. State law protects the community against financial obligation in case the firm defaults on payments.

The fact that municipalities hold title to the project until all bonds are paid led to the erroneous advice of a Farm House attorney on ways to avoid sales tax payments, Sweet said.

The attorney told company officials to name Canton as the owner of the warehouse at Van Born and Haggerty on purchase orders for construction equipment and supplies, he said. Municipalities are exempt from sales tax obligations.

Canton Supervisor Noel Culbert said the Farm House attorney overlooked another Michigan statute which requires companies with EDC financing to pay sales tax.

Sweet maintains that Farm House Foods never intended Canton to receive its bills. Company purchasing agents listed three parties on order forms: Canton as the owner of the building, the warehouse as the shipping destination, and the company's Detroit office as the bill-paying agency.

He attributed the billing error to the inability of vendors' computers to handle three addresses. The bills received in Canton all list the township as the financially-responsible party and the warehouse as the shipping destination.

Sweet said the company notified its suppliers of the billing problem weeks ago. But the bills continue to dribble into township hall.

"I'll be damned if I know how we can get these people to stop," he said.

"I feel like travelling around the country and strangling someone." He said all bills received by Farm House Foods have been paid.

SWEET PLANS to attend Tuesday's meeting of the township board in an effort to explain the problem and apologize for what he calls "an unfortunate error."

"I don't blame them for being mad. I was shocked when I learned we were being investigated for fraud," said Sweet from his office in Milwaukee.

"We're a Wisconsin-based company, and we had Wisconsin attorneys look into Michigan law. We were looking into a foreign state, so to speak."

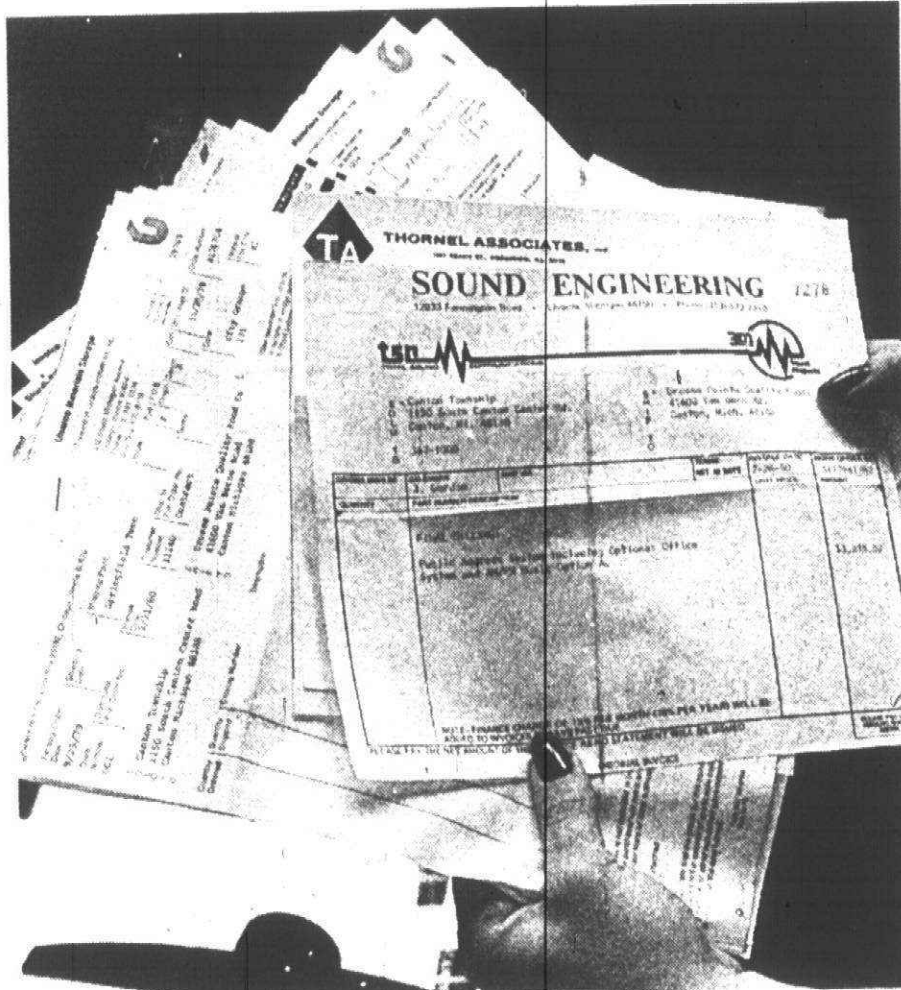
It appears that Sweet will have a rough time soothing the anger of the Canton board. Supervisor Culbert said he doubts that any additional EDC financing will be approved.

"This is bull," he said. I hope Farm House doesn't handle their business like they've handled this. They'd go bankrupt."

Deputy treasurer Maria Falkiewicz, who supervises bill paying in the township hall, said she received several angry phone calls from Farm House creditors who were upset over the billing confusion.

Sweet said his firm is asking for an additional \$500,000 in EDC financing to purchase equipment for the Canton warehouse.

The \$4.7 million already received in EDC funds was used to purchase land, construct the 190,000 square-foot warehouse and cover some equipment costs. The bonds must be paid off over the next 25 years.

Tax bills curbed by Headlee law

Remember the Headlee amendment?

Its promise to restrain spiraling property taxes has come to fruition for the first time.

That doesn't mean the tax bills you'll receive next December will be any lower than this year's.

But what could have been an 18 percent increase in the general tax bill from Canton Township will be sliced to an expected 13 percent hike, because voters approved Headlee in 1978.

The law requires units of governments to roll back their millages when property assessments increase at a rate greater than inflation.

Property assessments in Canton — the basis for tax bill computations — are expected to rise 18 percent this year. That's greater than the expected inflation rate for 1980 and the estimated 1979 figure of 13 percent.

millage rate on its own if Headlee has not been approved.

All units of government which tax in Canton, such as school districts and the county, will receive similar instructions from the state in order to keep their taxation powers in line with inflation.

To the taxpayer, the impact of Headlee is limited to what might have been. Rising property assessments more than compensate for required reductions in the millage.

But total tax bills could rise even higher without Headlee.

"I don't think it's a large impact," Gorman said of the tentative roll-back in Canton. "But Headlee is certainly doing what some people hoped."

The law only applies to taxes which can be levied without a vote.

Charter townships like Canton can levy a maximum five mills. The township's tentative "reduction factor" of .95 means the charter ceiling must be reduced by 5 percent, Gorman said.

He pegged the township's 1980 charter ceiling at 4.75 mills because of Headlee. Gorman expects the ceiling will continue to drop until the unlikely time that property assessments decline.

Not affected by Headlee are special assessments. Three special taxes are levied in Canton — 1.25 mills for fire, 3.25 mills for police and one mill for the library.

Attorney protests

'Open' meeting shut by township board

A special meeting of the Canton board was closed to the public Friday night after a township attorney indicated that he would leave the session if a two-person audience remained in the room.

The meeting was called by township board members in the middle of last week to discuss the legalities of Canton's proposed zoning ordinance. The township board will consider adopting the ordinance at a special meeting this Thursday.

Supervisor Noel Culbert indicated before the session that the meeting would be open to the public.

Only two items appeared on the meeting agenda — discussion of the ordinance with attorneys and a closed session to discuss pending litigation.

But township attorney Bert Burgoyne refused to discuss the proposed zoning ordinance in public. He classified as "pending litigation" the threats of some persons to sue over the ordinance.

"If you want an open meeting, go ahead," said Burgoyne. "But I'll leave."

Under Michigan's Open Meeting Act, public bodies may hold closed sessions to discuss legal strategies with an attorney, the discipline of an employee, collective bargaining, the purchase or lease of real estate, review of employment applications or material exempt from public disclosure.

Only two audience members showed up for the meeting — a representative of the press and a former planning commissioner.

"It's the schedule — running to one job, and then running to another," he said. "My mind's willing, but my body isn't."

Donahue said he has been feeling "rotten" since last October.

"I have a baby I don't even have time for," he said of his 7-month-old

son. "When I am home, I'm sleeping. I have no energy. I'm exhausted all the time."

Donahue has missed the township board's last two regular meetings and works only five hours a day at Moore Greens, a wholesale florist distributor. He said he was "napping" Friday afternoon in hopes of attending a special township board meeting that evening.

Constable mourns passing of job

Sam Natoli is a member of a disappearing breed.

He has worn the official badge of Canton Township since 1978, when he and three other residents were elected to the office of constable.

But Natoli, Robert Suggs, Irene Murphy and Jack Blevins will have to scratch any plans to seek reelection this November. The position of constable will not even appear on the ballot.

The township board abolished the office last week, mainly on the grounds of limited ballot space and continued growth in the number of candidates and propositions.

Clerk John Flodin said the township's 1978 ballot offered space for 50 names or issues. He said 49 of them were filled.

The constable job has deteriorated in recent years, particularly after passage of a 1972 state law which requires certification and minimum training levels for police officers.

Until that time, constables could make arrests for misdemeanors.

Supervisor Noel Culbert now calls the job "an archaic position — just a nice title."

NATOLI, one of the township's more active constables, accepted the news sheepishly last week.

"I thought I had done something wrong," said Natoli, a Ford Motor Co. employee who collects delinquent ambulance fees for the township during evenings and weekends.

"I've got another year with Ford's, and I figured I could spend more time

with this. I already picked up my reelection petitions from township hall."

Anyone with authorization from a municipality or court can collect ambulance fees or deliver court summons — a common occupation of constables during the past few years.

But Natoli, who also serves as a reserve police officer, maintains that his effectiveness will be eroded by the absence of his constable badge.

"To me, it seems you get more respect when you say you're a constable of Canton Township and you show them your badge," he said.

Natoli, 55, said he decided to run for constable in 1978 because a friend held that position in Dearborn.

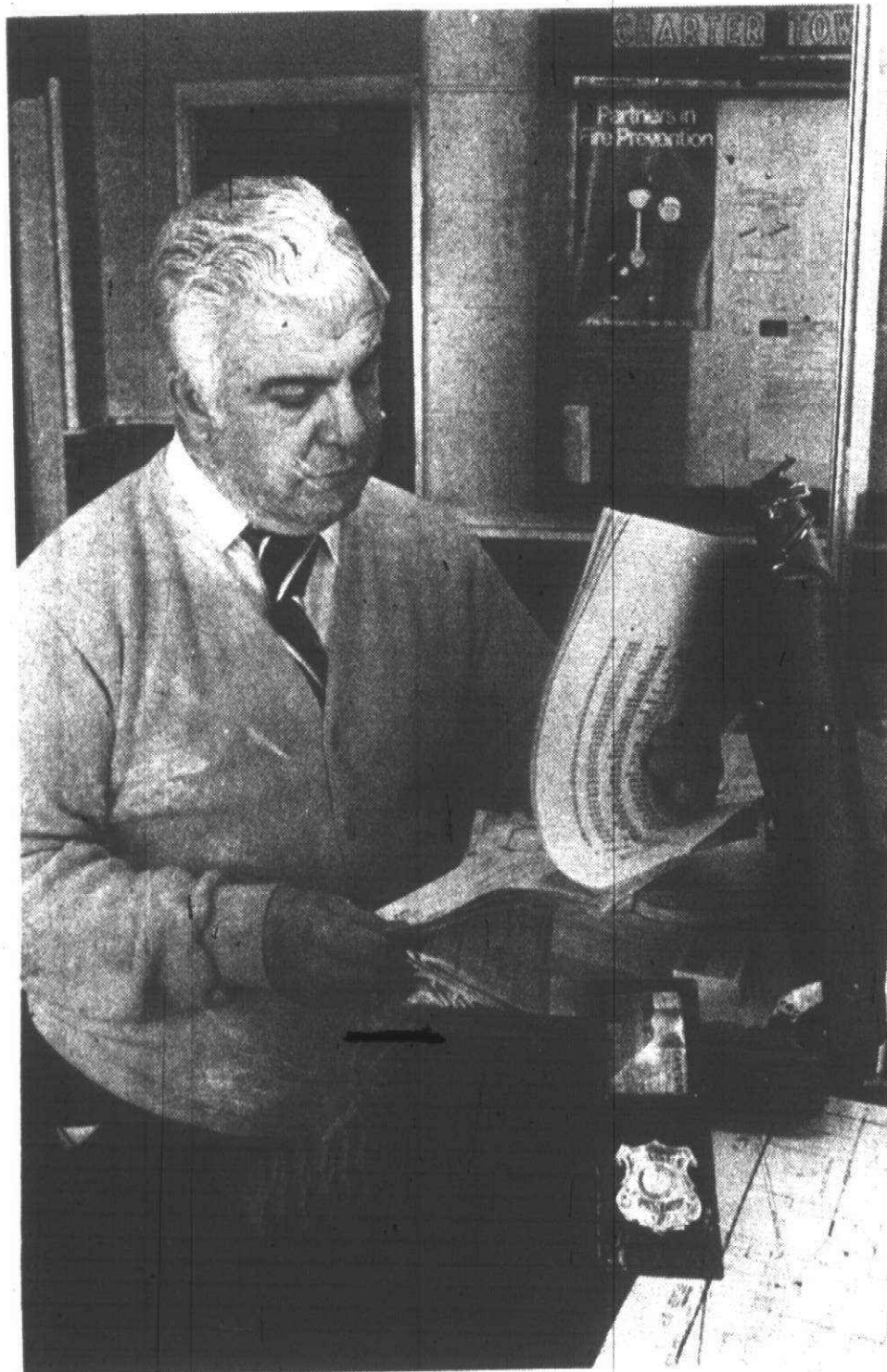
"I never believed I would be elected, to tell you the truth. But now, I think I've done a pretty good job."

THE CONSTABLE office does not cost the township anything in terms of money. Constables only receive pay for work performed, and it costs nothing to place candidates' names on the ballot.

Last week the township board appeared to lean toward a position of keeping the constable job — until Flodin brought up the problem with ballot space.

According to Culbert, the constable office stems from medieval England where constables served as the local law enforcement officer.

"Historically, the constable was the law enforcement officer in many Michigan communities," said the attorney. "But now it's mainly a ceremonial title."

Ticket seller guilty of scalping

A Plymouth Township woman who operated a ticket buying service in Northville Township for two years was found guilty Thursday of ticket scalping.

In a six-hour jury trial before Judge James Garber, Debra Lynn Andrews, 28, was found guilty of illegally inflating ticket prices to concerts and ball games without the permission of the promoters. The charge is a misdemeanor.

The trial was held in Canton Township's 35th District Court.

Ms. Andrews faces a maximum fine of 90 days in jail and/or a \$100 fine. Garber said the case has been referred

to the county's probation department and sentencing is set for April 16.

According to Garber, Ms. Andrews testified Thursday to buying up to \$150,000 in tickets annually from entertainment outlets like Pine Knob and Tiger Stadium. She then resold them to individual customers as well as in large blocks to such corporations as Blue Cross/Blue Shield and General Motors.

She also testified to reselling tickets for the Kentucky Derby and the Indianapolis 500 auto race.

In some cases, the price was upped by \$5 and in others, like for tickets to Pine Knob Concerts, the resale price was \$10 more than the listed price, according to testimony.

Her service was based in the Apple Records and Tape Shop, a business she owned in the Northville Plaza Mall.

Although the record and tape shop has since closed, Ms. Andrews is continuing her ticket business elsewhere. According to Garber, the business is located somewhere in Plymouth.

ACCORDING TO Ms. Andrews attorney, Carl Shaner, she maintains she was not operating her business — Executive Ticket Service — illegally.

He said she sold the tickets at their face value and then charged an additional service fee for her efforts.

According to the court, when tickets are sold by a second party, the seller must receive permission to do so from

the management and then print the service charge on the ticket.

Shaner said the state statute that addresses ticket scalping, passed last June, is complex and "not well written."

"We may appeal and let a higher court interpret it," he said, adding no decision to appeal has been made at this time.

Ms. Andrews was arrested by Northville Township police on Oct. 9, 1979 and was released on \$100 cash bond.

She was charged with ticket scalping after a Northville Township officer, wearing plain clothes, entered her business on Sept. 6 and purchased two tickets — one to a Tiger baseball game and another to a Pine Knob concert.

Young novelists' work 'published'

Some working authors struggle for years to get their first published novel. But at Smith School in Plymouth, novel writing has become child's play. Smith Elementary School, which houses grades from kindergarten to fifth, is the first school in the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools to offer novel writing classes to all youngsters.

(In case you're wondering how a kindergartener gets to write a book, these students have their contributions tape recorded and it's later rewritten for them.)

The program has had results and now the school's library has a full sup-

ply of completed and bonded books written by its students.

According to Smith's chief librarian, Dolores Prom, the program has been made available through a joint \$875 grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts and the Plymouth Community Arts Council.

To establish the program, published author Joan Potter Elwart, who wrote such children's books as "The Five Star General" and "Daisy Tells," was brought in to assist.

At the start of the year, she began working with individual classroom teachers in creative writing.

Visiting the classrooms, she'd attempt to spark some creative ideas among the children through impromptu story telling.

And she asked the students to put together a story centering around some innate object.

Before long, the children wrote stories, either individually or in a group, and, with the help of school mothers, had them bond into books.

Some students selected poetry as their subject matter. Another student created an entire story around an ink block. A third told a story about a flow-

Mrs. Prom said the students use their own artwork to illustrate their stories. With her help, they learn about the make-up of a book; how to write chapters and indexes.

The Smith program is similar to a district-wide Young Authors Program. This program, however, is not offered to all students but rather selects a few students for a contest sponsored in the spring.

"We felt the young author's program is a good one, but it doesn't reach all the kids in the schools," she said. "We wanted an ongoing program for students with all abilities."

Expanded flood insurance available

Additional flood insurance soon will be available to homeowners and businesspersons in the Plymouth community.

The availability of increased coverage is the result of a flood insurance study which just recently has been completed.

Persons most directly affected by the flood insurance study may learn more by attending a public meeting beginning at 7:30 p.m. Thursday in the Plymouth City Hall, Church and Main.

THE STUDY includes flood plain maps showing the areas which would

be inundated by a "100-year flood."

The study also includes flood elevation profiles, and flood insurance rate maps. The rate maps are used by financial institutions and insurance agents to determine who must purchase flood insurance and the cost of that insurance, explained Plymouth City Manager Henry Graper Jr.

The final issuance of the study will result in a change in Plymouth's status from the "emergency phase" to the "regular phase" of the National Flood Insurance Program, Graper said.

At that time, the amount of flood in-

surance now available to homeowners and businesses in Plymouth will increase.

THE ADDITIONAL amounts of insurance, Graper added, will be subject to actuarial rates rather than the federally-subsidized rates which now are available.

The city of Plymouth will be required to adopt and enforce a flood plain management ordinance to regulate all new construction and substantial rehabilitation in the flood hazard areas designed in the report, the manager said.

The study was funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and covers Tonquish Creek and portions of the Middle Rouge River. Persons with homes or businesses near these areas will be interested in attending Thursday's meeting to learn more about the study.

Representatives of the Federal Insurance and Hazard Mitigation Division of the Federal Emergency Management Agency will be on hand to explain the study and answer questions about the flood insurance program.

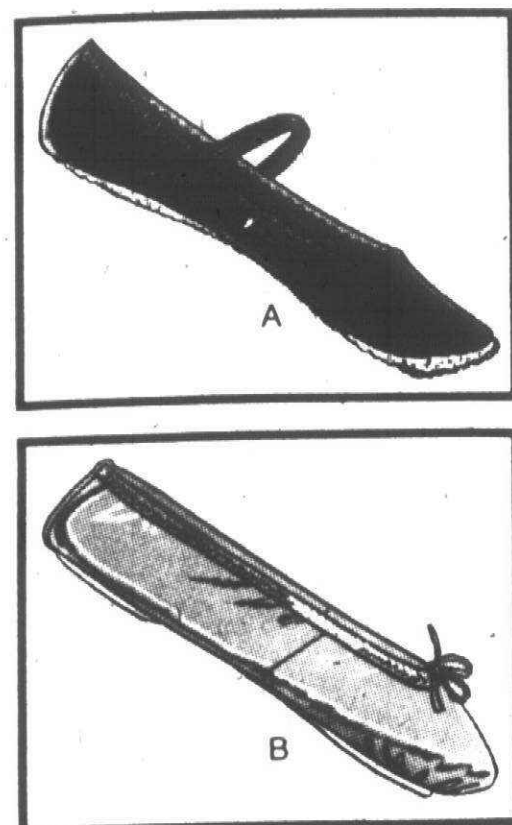
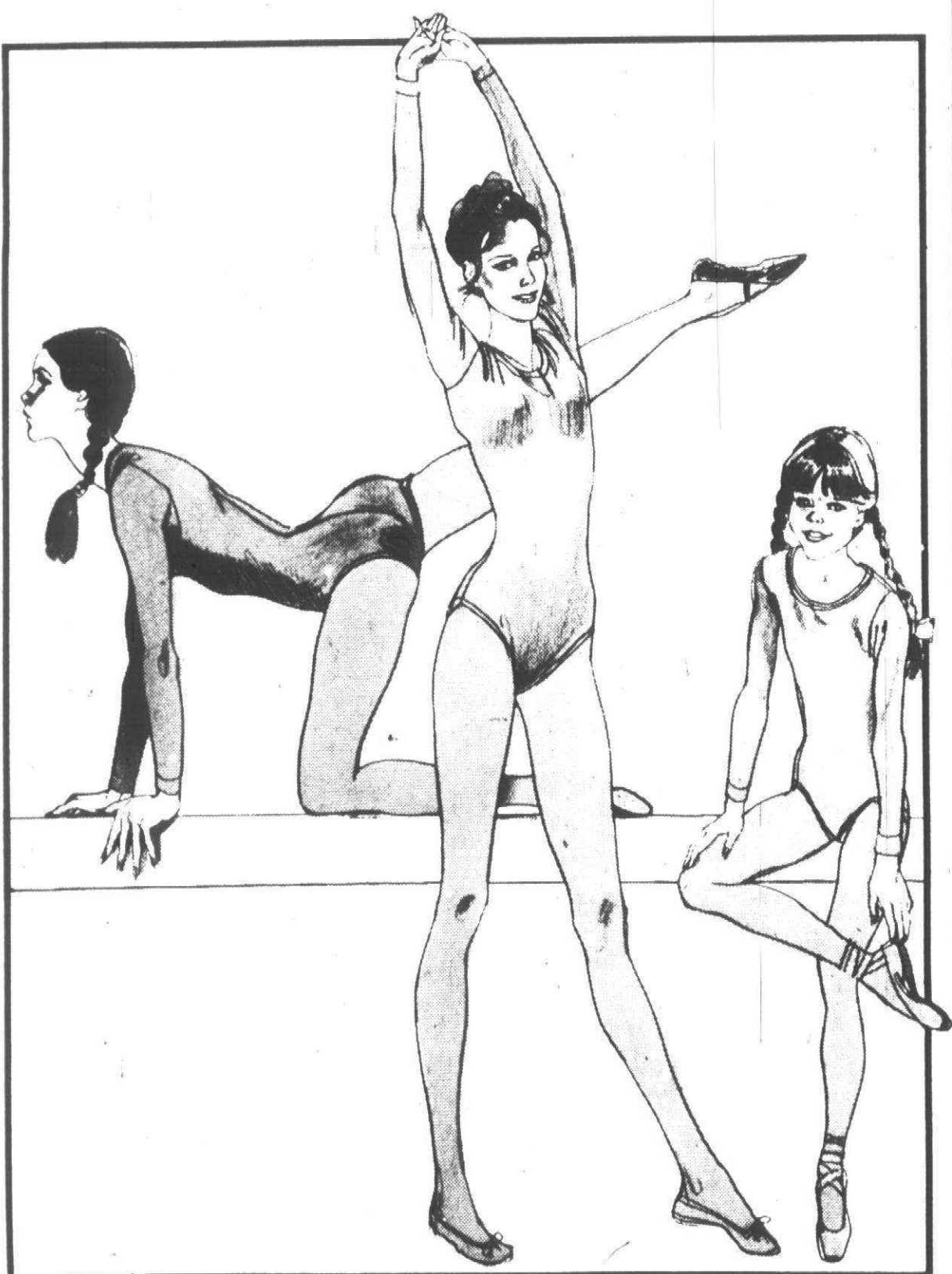

Brown & Smith split votes

Suburban reps rebuff subway

A substantial majority of state representatives from south Oakland and western Wayne counties say they'll oppose initial state funding of SEMTA's proposed Woodward Avenue subway and surface light rail system.

And some legislators say Detroit and Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) officials may have to reduce the length of the proposed downtown to McNichols (Six Mile) Road subway in order to obtain preliminary funding for SEMTA's 1990 regional transportation plan.

EIGHT OF 12 legislators interviewed late last week said they would remain solid "no" votes against funding an engineering study for the light rail system, which is proposed to run on surface from McNichols to 10 Mile Road in Royal Oak.

State Rep. Joseph Forbes, D-Oak Park, whose district includes part of Southfield, and Rep. Thomas Brown, D-Westland, said they favor the subway study.

Rep. Alice Tomboulion, D-Oakland Township, said she's uncommitted. Rep. Richard Fessler, R-West Bloomfield, could not be reached for comment but has been a strong subway opponent.

At issue is nearly \$1 million in state funds which would be part of a state and federally financed engineering study of the proposed subway system.

SEMTA can't apply for a \$16 million federal grant for the study until the state approves its share. The total state share is an estimated \$4 million.

SEMTA General Manager Larry Salci said the subway study is "eight or 10" votes short of the 55 needed to pass. The measure barely passed the Michi-

gan Senate last month with the required 20 votes.

"No question we have a problem right in our own back yard," Salci said referring to the strong suburban opposition. Many legislators believe the engineering study vote to be their last chance to defeat the subway, a priority of Detroit Mayor Coleman Young.

"IT'S NOT the suburbs versus Detroit," said Forbes. "It's the suburbs versus Coleman Young. That's unfortunate." The issue has been pending before the House for nearly three weeks.

Rep. Roy Smith, R-Saline, a subway opponent, says he won't compromise but predicted the system as proposed by SEMTA will pass.

"They'll get the votes," Smith said of subway proponents. "What will they have to pay? Maybe projects in other representatives' districts to get it, but they'll get it."

"They're doing a little horse trading."

That's the governmental process."

But Republican Jack Kirksey of Livonia says SEMTA may have backed itself into a corner with the subway and may have to compromise.

"SEMTA got locked in on whatever they decided politically had to have some subway in it," said Kirksey. A subway opponent, Kirksey said his opposition has "no other overtones other than the fact that the subway aspect of the package is not a wise use of tax money."

Mrs. Tomboulion, D-Rochester, refused to say how she'll vote on the issue. "I'm looking at all sides of it," she said.

"The debate in Lansing is how it will effect you if you vote for it. Now the (Oakland) county (state) representatives are talking more about what would happen to you as a representative than about the issue."

This is a re-election year for House

members, and Mrs. Tomboulion is expected to face stiff Republican opposition. Senators don't run until 1982.

LIVONIA MAYOR Edward McNamara, SEMTA board chairman, said the House vote "is going to be awful touch-and-go."

"The Republicans, the governor can't seem to be able to put them together," said McNamara, a Democrat. "The longer it goes on, the tougher it's going to be."

Salci said a key issue may be a stronger commitment from Young that the Detroit Department of Transportation (D-DOT) will merge with SEMTA.

Some legislators want Young to agree to put the sale of D-DOT on this November's general election ballot. Salci said Young is considering the proposal but hasn't made a decision.

"No question it would help," said Salci.

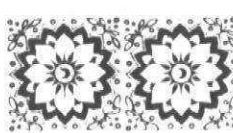

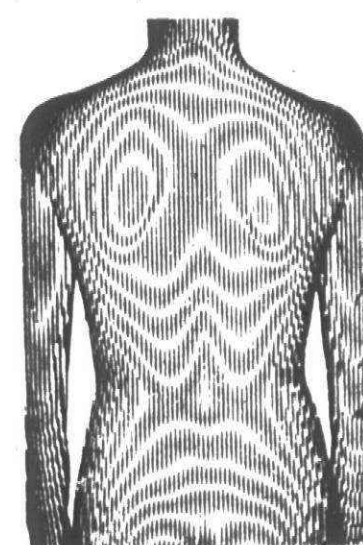

Fired-up Canton zaps Rocks for title

The hex is finally over. Plymouth Canton's basketball team came off age Saturday afternoon with a stunning 68-54 victory over its arch-rival, state-ranked Plymouth Salem. The Chiefs, now 17-6 overall, did it with an effective zone defense and timely free-throw shooting. More significantly, Canton captured its first district Class A title. It was also the first win over Salem in the school's seven-year history. The win left Canton coach Craig Bell almost in a daze. "I still haven't felt it yet," he said. "This is a super win for us. It means a lot to our total program and school. "It feels good to get one back. We have high regard for each other. We respect Plymouth Salem very much." Canton's tight zone defense bottled up Salem's high scoring center Howard Monk, who was limited to 16 points, seven below his norm. He did not score in the third quarter. Canton frontliners

Dave Visser, Brad Westin and Sean Houle all helped to prevent Monk from getting the ball inside. "Monk is a fine player," said Bell. "Our kids did a great job. We always knew where he was." But it was the smallest man on the floor who gave Salem the most problems. Senior 6-foot guard Scott Adler, who led all scorers with 22 points, came through by hitting some clutch shots in the second half.

CANTON WENT into the dressing room at intermission leading 27-25. The Chiefs controlled most of the first half and led all the way except for the early stages of the game. Salem senior guard Rob Neu came out and hit the first shot of the second half to tie the game at 27. The Rocks, however, were unable to gain the lead. "We felt the first three minutes of the third quarter were critical to us," said Salem coach Fred Thomann. "We knew they (Canton) would pack that zone up. We just didn't deal with it."

"We didn't shoot the ball as well as we had liked to." Canton began to mount a lead again behind the shooting of Houle, who canned three outside shots. His baskets kept Salem at arm's length. The steady Chiefs went into the final quarter with a 44-38 lead. Sensing a victory, Canton came out fired up in the fourth quarter. Forward Westin, who finished with 17 points, hit two straight inside shots early in the fourth quarter to give the Chiefs a 48-40 lead. Salem then got into foul problems. Salem defensive standout Jim Anderson exited with 6:29 left when he was called for a blocking foul against Adler on a drive to the basket. One minute later, sophomore Mike McBride also fouled out.

ADLER SCORED six points in the last minute to put the game away. "They played awfully well," said Thomann, whose team finished the year with a 17-4 mark. "We just didn't get into our normal rhythm." Canton connected on pressure free throws to keep Salem from staging a comeback. Visser, who finished with 14 points, hit 12 of 13 free throws. He and Westin also controlled the boards by grabbing 11 and nine respectively. Adler also had a good night at the line, canning 10 of 13. Houle came up with one of his best efforts this year. He scored 12 points and grabbed eight boards. Junior guard Dave Malek spearheaded the defense and contributed on offense with five assists. In the first quarter Malek created a steal which Adler converted into a three-point play to give the Chiefs a 22-16 first-quarter advantage. Canton will take its 12-game winning streak into the regionals Wednesday at Ypsilanti.

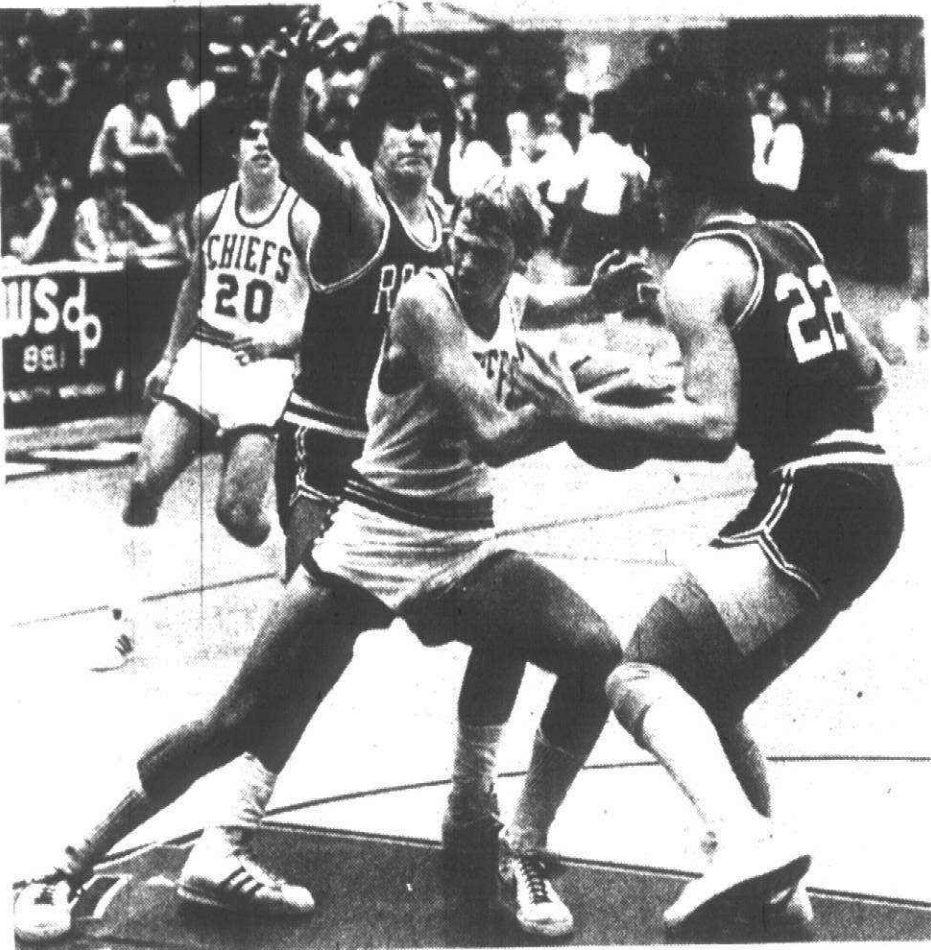

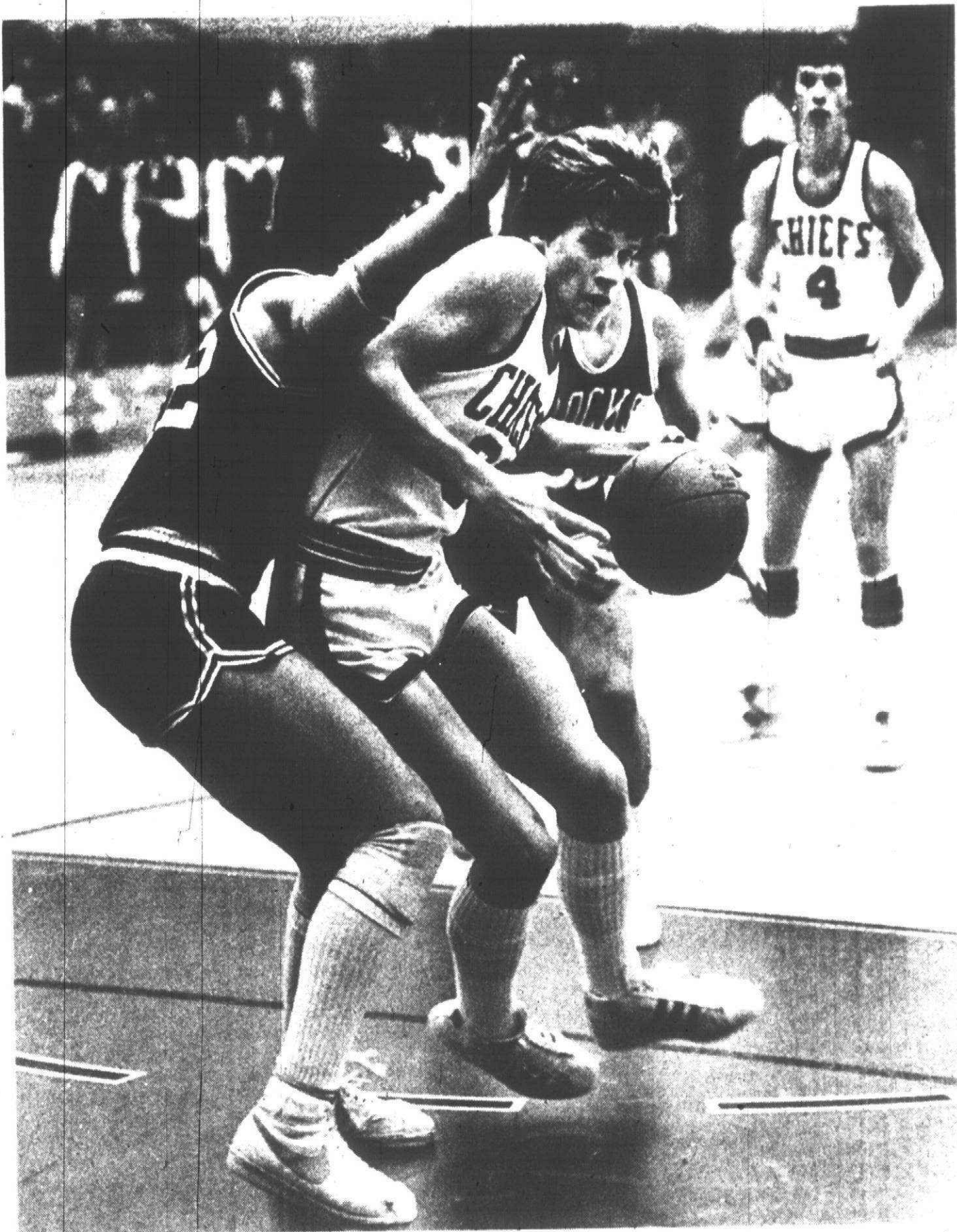

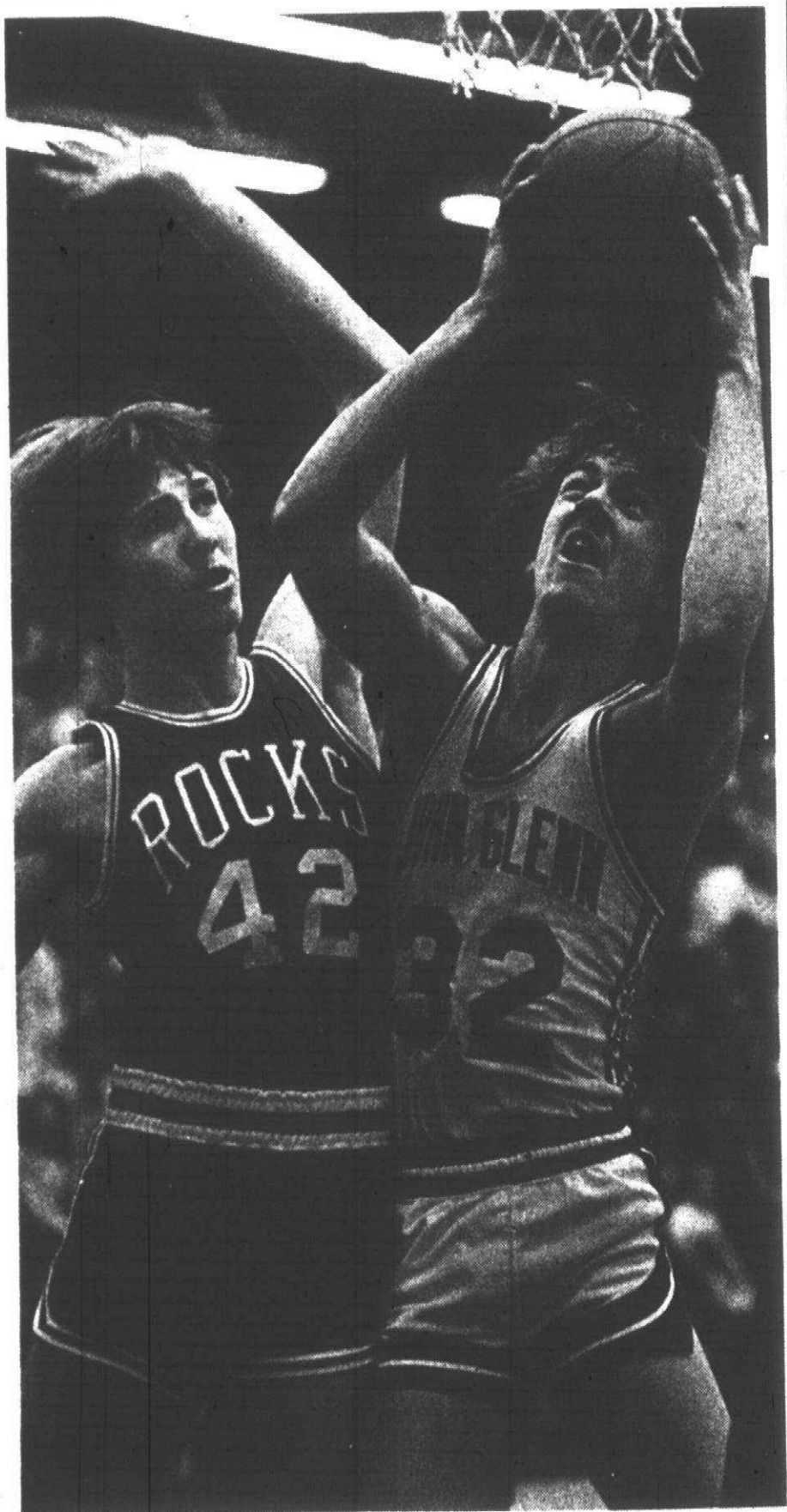

Belleville rules Suburban 8 loop; Salem swimmers gain 5th spot

State Class A contender Belleville ran away with the Suburban Eight League swim title Friday night by racking up 329 points.

The Tigers outscored host Livonia Bentley by 120 points. The meet was held at Schoolcraft Community College in Livonia.

Belleville won four of 11 races to claim the first-place prize. Following second-place Bentley (209) were Dearborn (179), Trenton (163), Plymouth Salem (136) and Dearborn Edsel Ford (86).

Bentley's Mark Winter and Paul Dudley were the individual stars. Both swimmers won two events.

Winter won the 200-yard individual medley with ease, posting an outstanding time of 2:00.186. He also took the 100-yard breaststroke with a clocking of 1:01.130.

Dudley took the 200- and 500-yard freestyle events with times of 1:47.976 and 4:51.935, respectively.

Bentley's Norm Gauthier finished second behind Belleville's Ward Tomich in the 100-yard backstroke. Gauthier's time was 59.115.

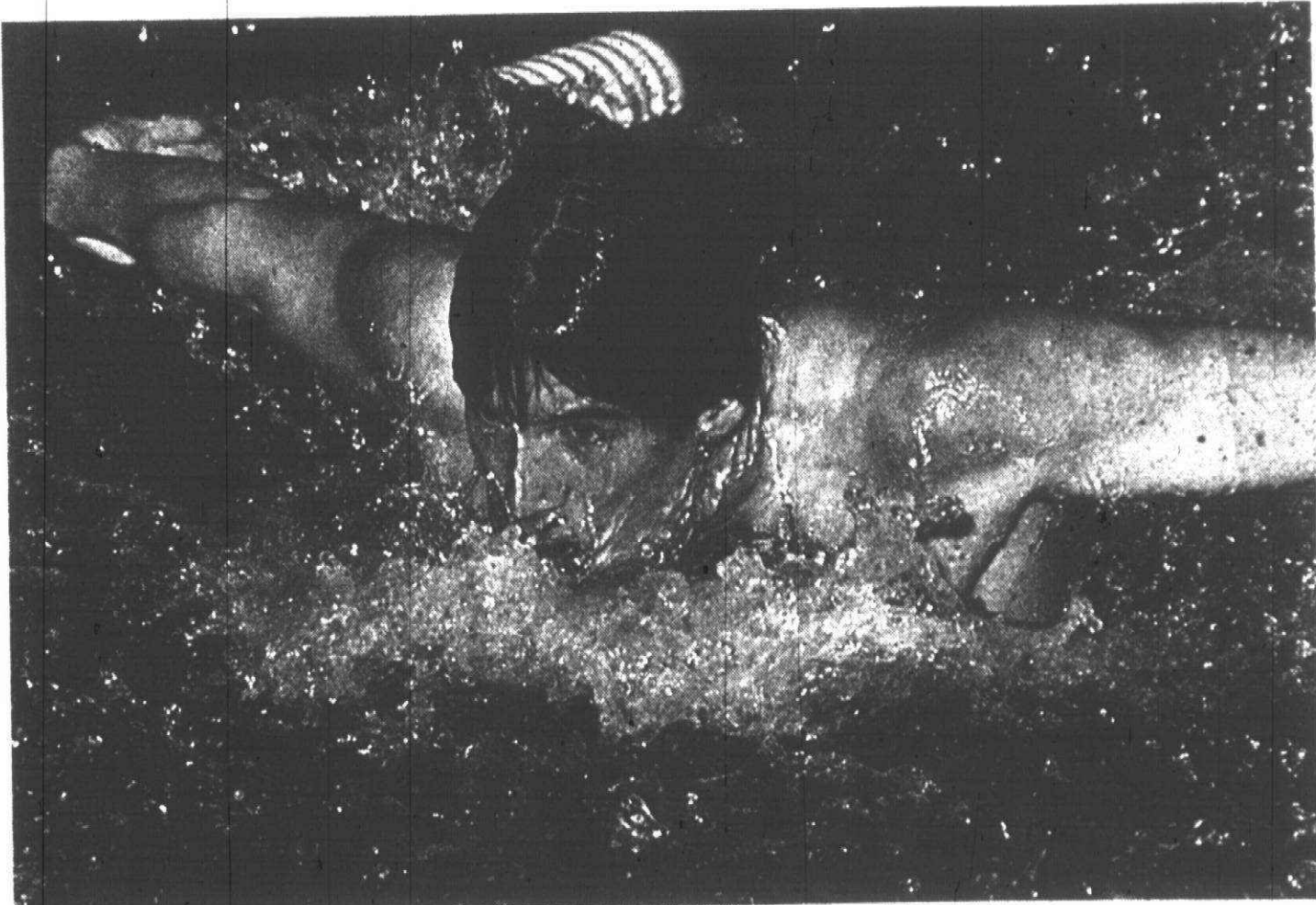
Ron Cisko of Bentley gained third in the 200-yard IM with a time of 2:08.077.

Dearborn won the opening event, the 200-yard medley relay, upsetting Belleville with a time of 1:42.118. But the Tigers, getting a lift from Tomich and Chris Renton, won the 400-yard freestyle relay (3:20.023). Bentley took third in that race. The Bulldog team consisted of Dudley, Winter, Cisko and Colin Henry. They posted a time of 3:21.757.

SALEM, which finished fourth overall, placed fourth in both relays.

Co-captain Kirk Albert, a senior, recorded Salem's best individual finish as he took third in the 100-yard butterfly (55.930). Renton won the race with a fast clocking of 54.7 (hand timed). Salem's other top finisher was sophomore Russ Shaffer, who came in fourth in the gruelling 500-yard freestyle (5:05.634).

The diving competition attracted some of the top performers in the state and, as expected, Belleville's Pat McClelland took first with a total of 432.8 points. Bentley's Don Wynne placed fourth overall with a total of 371.15.

Stevenson played for a last shot after that, but the scrambling Patriots forced a jump ball with seven seconds left. Hall won the tip and Tom Finn launched a 22-footer that bounced off the back of the rim as the buzzer sounded to end regulation time.

Hall jammed the ball through the hoop following a Franklin turnover 26 seconds into the overtime to give Stevenson the lead. Ron Lohman tied the score 11 seconds later with a pair of free throws.

Hall flipped the ball into the basket from close range 10 seconds later to give the Spartans a 57-55 edge. That turned out to be the final score, but there was plenty of action the last 2:15 of overtime.

Rocks gain revenge against Glenn

Plymouth Salem gained revenge in a big way Thursday night. The Rock cagers advanced to the district finals against rival Plymouth Canton with a convincing 79-52 win over Westland John Glenn.

Salem avenged one of its three losses against the Rockets. Glenn upset Salem early last month, 68-64.

Senior tri-captains Howard Monk, Rob Neu and Jim Anderson convinced the crowd of 1,500 that they meant

business the second time around.

Monk, a 6-foot-6 center, was outstanding all night as he finished with 32 points and 22 rebounds. Neu, a 6-1 guard, stabilized the Rocks with a fine floor game. He tallied 14 points while the ubiquitous Anderson added 10 points and eight rebounds.

"They got after us," said Glenn Coach Dan Henry, whose young team finished the year with a 10-12 mark. "Our game plan was to front Monk

just like last time," he added. "Tonight was his night. He and Anderson played tough and they threaded the needle all night long."

Salem opened up the game with a flurry midway through the third quarter. Glenn narrowed Salem's eight point halftime lead to four, 39-35, on Dave Ward's baseline drive layup.

But Salem suddenly got hot, scoring the next 15 points.

NEU'S LAYUP with 1:28 left in the third period gave the Rocks an unsurmountable 58-37 advantage.

"I thought the key was that we dealt with their pressure real well," said Salem Coach Fred Thomann. "Another key was that we kept them off the offensive boards."

Salem's defense was effective as Glenn was forced to shoot from the perimeter more than normal.

"For our guys it was sort of a pride thing," Thomann said. "We were pretty intense and aggressive. In the second half we did a nice job defensively."

Glenn battled Salem most of the first half with its pressure man-to-man defense.

The Rocks led after one quarter, 16-13, and took a 39-31 lead into the dressing room at halftime.

"They played great defense," complimented Henry, who returns eight of his top 10 players next season.

"We're looking forward to next year," he said.

Junior center Dave Ward paced the Rockets, a member of the Northwest Suburban League, with 10 points. Bob Sisson, also a junior, came off the bench to add nine. Kevin Thweatt and senior Wayne Woodward, chipped in with eight each.

The win upped Salem's overall mark to 17-3.

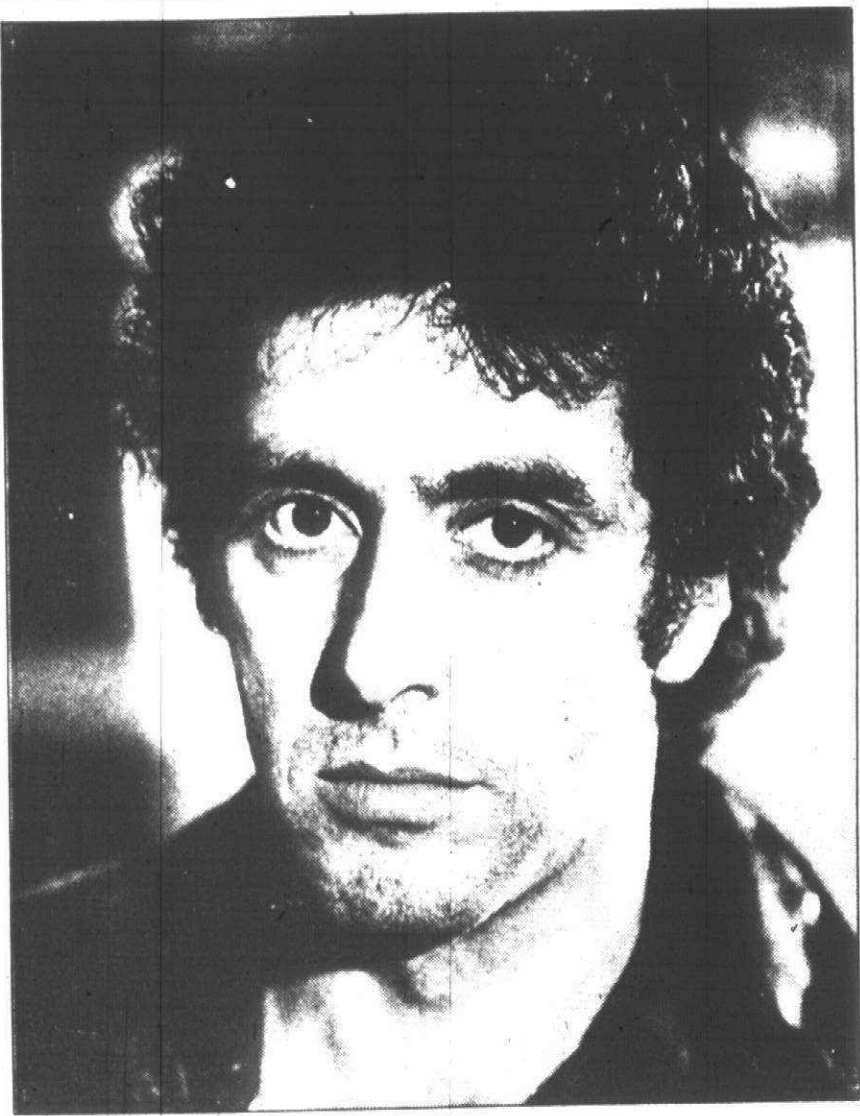

'Cruising' shows gay community without insight

Mayor Diane Feinstein of San Francisco, who has her problems with the city's large gay community, called "Cruising" (R) "provocative trash" without benefit of seeing it. Having seen it, one hates to admit it, but the mayor's uninformed judgement was right.

Al Pacino plays a New York City policeman who goes undercover in the homosexual hangouts of Greenwich Village to find the sadistic killer responsible for a series of stabbing deaths among the denizens of this nether world.

What the movie has to offer, for those who are curious about or turned on by the heavy leather scene, is a lot of suggestive imagery of straining, twisted male bodies in various stages of undress and sexual gratification. (This is an "R" film which shades into an "X.")

It's a dark, sweaty tableau of degradation which could pass for one of the circles of Dante's Hell.

INCIDENTS WITH police who are hassling and abusing the homosexuals, suggest the gays aren't the only ones with hangups, but "Cruising" provides neither a sociological point of view nor psychological insight. The film displays no concern for the situation and no interest in examining the whys and wherefores of this community or of the hostility it arouses among the police force.

The closest the film gets to the realities of daily, or nightly, life is a quick lesson on the mores of the selection and mating process. Sexual preferences are indicated by the color of a man's bandana and the pocket in which he wears it — the modern equivalent, perhaps, of the way the dandy of an earlier century wore his rapier or sword.

Director William Friedkin, who hasn't scored at the box office since "The Exorcist," has to depend on shock value to grab an audience. Evidence of his attempt to force the film to fit his game plan for maximum morbid impact is available from the beginning.

A tugboat pulls a human arm out of the harbor. The stiff, grayish blue appendage is placed on a morgue slab with an assortment of other parts. Several times in the film the police talk about linking the killer of the knifed homosexuals with these dismemberments. But the link is never forged, so who introduce these grisly crimes?

THE ONLY REASON is to keep popping shocking scenes in front of the audience, because "Cruising" has nothing else going for it.

Neither Pacino, nor the suspected killer (Richard Cox), nor the chief of detectives (Paul Sorvino), nor Pacino's girlfriend (Karen Allen) ever develops a dimensional character. The thoughts and feelings of Pacino's cop are as much a puzzle at the end of the film as at the beginning.

We never learn how he feels about assimilating into the homosexual subculture or how it is affecting him. Worse yet, for a murder mystery, everything is left ambiguous.

The gay community which brought this film so much publicity with its protests might have been wiser to keep silent and wait for the public to find out for itself. "Cruising" offers only a grubby sensationalism.

It's filled with red herrings; its characters are uninteresting; its point of view is confusing; its images are sordid; it's a rotten film.

Some Canadian friends of ours, who like chutney, (a sweet-sour relish), bought a jar at the bazaar. Later, they told an Englishwoman in the church how much they enjoyed the chutney.

"Oh, you must tell Lady Young," the woman said. "She will be so pleased."

Later, after we had the privilege of meeting Lady Young, we discovered she not only makes excellent chutney, she is the first one up at church suppers when tables need cleaning off or dishes need washing.

WE WERE INTRODUCED to Holy Trinity, an Anglican Church, by Ted Hoffer, an ex-Californian who has lived in Cannes for 13 years.

"That sounds like an American voice," he called out when he heard us speaking in a supermarket. Apparently, you don't hear many American voices in Cannes this time of the year.

Hoffer is one of three church wardens at Holy Trinity. He invited us to attend services on the following Sunday and we have been going every Sunday since.

College trustees get grim news

Even as Schoolcraft College buildings age, the maintenance share of the budget is getting slimmer.

That grim news was given to the community college's board of trustees by W. Kenneth Lindner, vice-president for administrative affairs.

In the current 1979-80 budget, such "special purposes" as maintenance and new equipment received \$233,000 or 5.7 percent of local property taxes which totaled \$4.2 million.

That proportion has steadily declined from 6.3 percent in 1978-9, 7.6 percent in 1975-6 and 8.4 percent in 1974-5.

BOARD CHAIRMAN Harry Greenleaf said Lindner's chart demonstrated clearly that Schoolcraft must pay greater attention to its physical plant.

In a preliminary budget report to trustees Feb. 27, Lindner said the administration's budget committee has lumped maintenance projects into two groups. Group I "should be funded this coming year. Group II should be funded if monies were available," he said.

The \$144,000 in Group I projects included: the second phase of a Six Mile access road, \$32,000; a new fire alarm system, \$50,000; survey and repairs of heating elements in the Library, Administration and Forum buildings, \$15,000; roof repairs to the Liberal Arts, Forum, Administration and Library buildings, \$20,000; a security alarm system and parking lot repairs for the Garden City Center, nearly \$5,000 combined; and other repairs to concrete, the welding lab, the financial aids office and two conference rooms.

In addition, the list called for repairs to the well systems of four houses on Haggerty Road south of the campus that are used for

Holy Trinity, "the English-speaking church," is the sole survivor of four Anglican churches that thrived here when Cannes had a large English colony.

St. George's, high on the hill in a high-rent district called "Californie," was once the church of the aristocracy. Members of the English royal family attended there. Commoners were not allowed, although servants were permitted to attend evening services.

Of the three other churches, one was "high church," Holy Trinity was low church, and the other was somewhere in between.

The English colony in Cannes had its origin in 1834 when a Lord Chancellor of England, Lord Brougham, made his first visit there. After each world war, the colony began to dwindle. Holy Trin-

ity is now the only English-speaking church in Cannes.

The church is one block from the beach, on Rue du Canada, behind the Hotel Carlton. An attractive building of modern design, it was completed in 1973, occupying the site where Old Trinity, "a musty, damp old building" had stood.

The cornerstone of the new building was laid by Lady Soames, wife of the man who now has his hands full as British colonial governor of Rhodesia.

The list of those who contributed to funds to pay for the new church includes two baronets and a Lady — Lady Colquhoun of Luss. Luss, one of my favorite thatched-roof villages in Scotland, is on the west bank of Loch Lomond.

accounting, placement, community service, and child care. The old houses have been used because of repeated failures of property tax requests for capital construction.

GROUP II projects include:

Resurfacing five driveways and parking lots, \$87,000; repiping the swimming pool system, \$40,000; replacing corridor heaters in the Forum, \$15,000; replacing eight doors in the administration building, \$5,000; and many modifications of heating, damper and boiler systems.

"In April," said Lindner, "subsequent deliberations by the budget committee could produce a final recommendation that could adjust the final allocations, but it is doubtful any substantive changes can be made."

IN OTHER business, the board of trustees accepted \$1,010 in gifts. The amounts, purposes and donors were:

• \$500 for purchase of a food processor and ice carving utensils for the Culinary Arts program from the Yondotega Club "in appreciation of a special dinner."

• A Heath television set worth \$250 for the electronics department from Allan Worth of Plymouth.

• Brazing equipment worth \$120 for the welding department from the Michigan Seamless Tube Division of Quanex Corp., South Lyon.

• A Frieden copier worth \$50 for the student activities office from Trustee Rosina Raymond of Livonia.

• A \$79.30 check for the Michael Bulger scholarship fund from the Michigan Depression Glass Society, which has used the Waterman Campus Center on occasion.

• A \$10 gift to the Women's Resource Center from Jane Boren Kaake of Northville.

I have never seen a sailboat with finer lines. When reparations are completed, I am told that he plans to use it as a meeting place for "the yachting crowd." Like the golfing set, they never seem to find time to attend church.

The assistant minister, who was trained at Oxford to be a geographer,

spent many years on the continent of Africa. It was there that he met his wife, a Scots woman, who had also gone to Africa to study and then teach.

We were recently invited to their apartment for tea and scones and lots of conversation. Ian showed us some of the marvelous slides he took years ago in Timbuktu.

Not the least among the attractions of Holy Trinity Church are the books on England, including Agatha Christie, of course, which you can borrow for a small landing fee — 10 cents for paperbacks, 20 cents for hardcovers.

It is an island in the sea of French journals, magazines and books that engulf us.

Fossil find may lead to whale's ancestor

What are "probably the oldest fossil whales" have been found in Pakistan on a geological expedition led by a University of Michigan paleontologist.

"The back part of a skull and several teeth belong to whales that inhabited the ancient Tethys Sea about 45 to 50 million years ago, called the Eocene age, when India and Pakistan formed a continent separate from the rest of Asia," estimates U-M Professor Philip D. Gingerich.

The remains may help provide information about the little known ancestors of whales, mammals that are believed to have lived on land before adapting completely to an aquatic environment, he says.

Gingerich and several U-M graduate

students in geology, along with a group of scientists from Pakistan and France, conducted field work in Pakistan during the autumn months of 1975, 1977, 1978, and 1979.

THE PROJECT, supported by a grant from the Smithsonian Institution, is a cooperative effort between the U-M and the Geological Survey of Pakistan to investigate the geological and biological history of the area.

In 1978, the researchers discovered primitive whale fossils embedded in a layer of solid rock in the Himalayan foothills, about halfway between Khyber Pass and the capital city of Islamabad.

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH
WAYNE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

ORDINANCE NO. 63

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ESTABLISHING A COMPENSATION COMMISSION, WHICH COMMISSION SHALL DETERMINE THE SALARY OF EACH TOWNSHIP ELECTED OFFICIAL.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

PART I. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited, amended and supplemented as the Compensation Commission Ordinance.

PART II. The purpose of this Ordinance shall be to establish a Commission, which shall determine the salary of each Township elected official, pursuant to The Charter Township Act, Act No. 175 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended, being §§42.1, et seq., Michigan Compiled Laws.

PART III. (1) A local official's Compensation Commission is created. The Commission shall consist of five members, who are registered electors of the Township, appointed by the Supervisor subject to confirmation by a majority of the members elected and serving on the Township Board of Trustees. The terms of office shall be five years, except that of the members first appointed, one each shall be appointed for terms of one, two, three, four and five years. All first members shall be appointed not more than thirty days after the effective date of this Ordinance. The terms of all first members shall expire on December 31st of their last year in office. Members other than first members shall be appointed before October 1st of the year in which the term of the preceding member expires. The term of office of a member other than a first member shall begin on January 1st of the year following his appointment. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of an unexpired term. An officer or employee of a government agency or unit or a member of the immediate family of that officer or employee shall not be appointed to the Commission.

(2) The Commission shall determine the salary of each Township elected official which determination shall be the salary unless the Township Board of Trustees by resolution adopted by two-thirds of the members elected to and serving on the Board rejects the determination. A determination of the Commission shall be effective thirty days following its filing with the Township Clerk unless rejected by the Township Board of Trustees. If a determination is rejected, the existing salary shall prevail. An expense allowance or reimbursement paid to an elected official in addition to salary shall be for expenses incurred in the course of Township business and accounted for to the Township.

(3) The Commission shall first convene on such date as the Township Board of Trustees by resolution may determine. The Commission shall meet for not more than fifteen session days in each odd numbered year and shall make a determination within forty-five calendar days of the first meeting of each year in which it meets. A majority of the members of the Commission constitutes a quorum for conducting the business of the Commission. The Commission shall not take action or make a determination without a concurrence of a majority of the members appointed and serving on the Commission. The Commission shall elect a chairperson from among the Commission's members. As used in this section, session means a calendar day on which the Commission meets and the quorum is present. The members of the Commission shall not receive compensation, but shall be entitled to actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of official duties.

(4) The business which the Commission may perform shall be conducted at a public meeting of the Commission held in compliance with Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, being Section 15.261 to 15.275 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. Public notice of the time, date, and place of the meeting shall be given in the manner required by Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976.

(5) The Township Board of Trustees may implement this Ordinance by resolution including the date for convening the Commission.

PART IV. If within sixty days after the effective date of this Ordinance a petition for a referendum on the Ordinance is filed with the Township Clerk containing the signatures of at least 5% of the registered electors of the Township of the effective date of the Ordinance, then a referendum on the Ordinance must be held. If a petition for referendum is filed a determination of the Commission shall not be effective until the Ordinance has been approved by the electors.

PART V. After one year following the effective date of this Ordinance, the procedure for establishing the compensation of Township elected officials may be changed by Ordinance.

PART VI. The Commission established by this Ordinance may operate when requested by resolution of the Board of Trustees as a committee for the purpose of advising the Township Board of Trustees on wage and salary levels for non-elected, non-union Township employees. Ultimate authority for the setting of such wage and salary levels remains entirely within the discretion of the Township Board of Trustees, to whom the Commission when acting as such committee shall be solely a recommending body.

PART VII. This Ordinance shall be effective March 10, 1980. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency ordinance.

PART VIII. Adopted this fourth day of March, 1980 by the Township Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Plymouth.

Former playmates head up company

Two former residents who once played together on the same block in Plymouth are now heading up a multi-million dollar corporation near Chicago.

Karl Hoenecke, 49, is the son of the former minister of St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church in Plymouth. Hoenecke grew up in Plymouth just four blocks away from G. Vern Diedrick, 43, a former saxophonist.

Today Hoenecke is chairman and chief executive officer and Diedrick is financial vice president of Federal Signal in Oakbrook, Ill.

Since Hoenecke took over as top executive the firm's revenues have more than doubled from \$60 million to \$121 million in 1979.

The pair has joined to revamp the management system and to launch an aggressive campaign of acquisitions to form a mini-conglomerate.

Federal-Signal today is the producer

business people

of lights and sirens for emergency vehicles, produces signs, and has acquired a leading aluminum fire truck manufacturer and has gotten into the tool and die line.

After joining Federal-Signal in 1974, both developed a five-year turnaround plan which has resulted in a five-year 33 percent compound income growth rate.

Before teaming up Hoenecke was with Rockwell International and Diedrick was with General Motors. The chairman has been described as a "aggressive, non-nonsense" type while Diedrick is categorized as a patient, cautious financial counselor.

THE TURNAROUND has resulted, though, in some casualties.

Former employees, unhappy with the new management's stress on accountability, resigned or were eased out.

In early 1978 some 10 salespersons left the firm. Hoenecke began weeding out executives who were unable to provide projections of future sales or current data on sales.

Next Diedrick and Hoenecke developed an acquisition strategy — to go after a company with a leading market share in a growth field akin to Federal's, with good management already in place, and owners who wanted to sell to a professional organization.

One of the first acquisitions was Emergency One, which had been a major buyer of Federal's flashing lights. Based in Florida, Emergency One makes aluminum fire trucks which because of their lighter weight are cheaper to operate. About 75 percent of their customers are volunteer fire departments.

Another early acquisition was the \$6.4 million purchase of Dayton Progress, an Ohio-based punch and die-butt firm.

With an 18 percent market share in an industry consisting mostly of small, alley job-shops, Dayton Progress contributed a 36 percent increase in 1979

with operating income totaling \$5.3 million with sales up 31 percent to \$25.7 million.

After watching Dayton Progress advances during the year, Hoenecke and Diedrick decided to acquire a \$2.5 million carbide cutting tool business in Indiana. Another decision was made to allocate 43 percent of its 1979-80 capital budget of \$6 million for expansion of Dayton's production facilities.

WHILE EXPANDING Federal's, at the same time, has been unloading its unprofitable holdings.

In fact some \$20 million has been divested since the new management team took over in 1974.

Part of an examination of priorities also led the corporation to put its sign business on a regional basis rather than remaining in the national marketplace.

The Signal division is hoping to continue its success even through a period of recession as municipalities make necessary safety purchases and as the federal and state governments tighten up on safety standards.

In 1980 Federal is expected to acquire an \$8 million midwest tool business and then add another division to the firm by acquiring a \$40 million company.

That's what two former playmates are now doing as business associates at a multi-million dollar corporation.

Presently, partners receive \$65 an

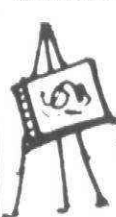
hour for township work and their associates receive \$53 an hour. There's a monthly retainer fee of \$106.50.

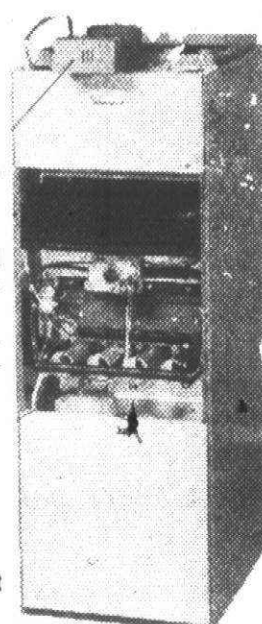

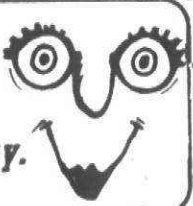

| 1 teaspoon salt | 1 pound leeks, sliced in 2-inch pieces |
| 2 tablespoons cooking fat | 1/2 cup tea |
| 3/4 cup water | 2 tablespoons snipped parsley |

Combine flour, salt and pepper; dredge roast. Reserve leftover flour. Brown roast in cooking fat in Dutch oven. Pour off drippings. Add water, instant bouillon and thyme. Cover tightly and cook slowly 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 hours. Add potatoes, continue cooking, covered, 40 minutes. Add leek and cook, covered, 20 minutes or until meat and vegetables are tender. (Allow approximately 45 minutes per pound for cooking.) Remove pot-roast and vegetables to warm platter. Combine reserved flour with 1/2 cup tea, add to cooking liquid and cook, stirring until thickened. Reduce heat and cook slowly 3 to 5 minutes. Sprinkle parsley over potatoes.

Corned Beef Brisket

- 3 to 5-pound corned beef brisket
Water

Place corned beef brisket in Dutch oven; add water to cover. Cover tightly and simmer 3 to 4 hours or until meat is tender. Remove meat from cooking liquid and carve diagonally across the grain into thin slices.

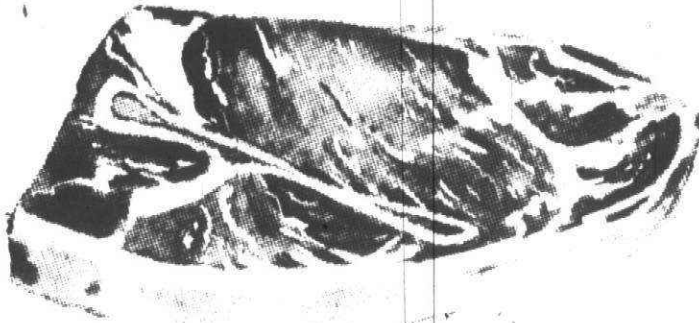

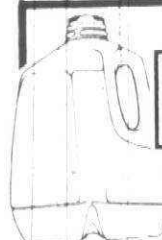

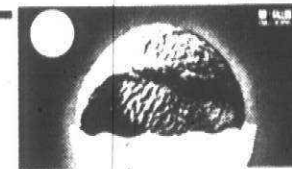

A Question of Taste

An Irish grandmother's bequest—good cooking

She had soft, white hair in a fashion rarely seen anymore. Her body was also soft in a fashion that has gone out of style as grandmothers join the national crusade for physical fitness.

Her skin was soft and sweet-smelling and she had what was, to my ears, a soft Irish brogue.

It was only many years after her death that I discovered that her thick, Northern-Irish brogue would have been considered harsh.

Somehow the harshness would have been more appropriate for the circumstances of her life. Her own mother died when my grandmother was only 4 years old.

At the age of 11 she left school to work in a mill 12 hours a day. When she was 15 her father re-married. Unhappy with her step-mother, she left home at the age of 18.

Ten years later she married my grandfather who ran "a shop," (a grocery store) in Belfast. Actually, she

must have run the shop herself much of the time because my grandfather was an IRA man on the run.

He finally fled Ireland and arrived in America as a political refugee in 1921 and was followed six months later by my grandmother and their four young children.

THE FACT that my grandfather had left Ireland without a passport was not a serious problem because they never intended to stay here permanently. Ten years and three more children later, my grandmother was still in Detroit, coping with an ailing husband and the Great Depression.

Times were tight but she always managed to feed her family well. Neighbors might have economized by eating bowls of popcorn and milk for supper, but the food in the Giffen home was abundant, of the best quality and lovingly prepared.

She even managed to feed the out-of-work men who came to her back door and who might not otherwise have eaten. This was all before my time, of course, recalled only from family stories.

What I can recall of my grandmother's cooking are her apple pies, crammed with fruit and fragrant with cinnamon, her strawberry jam and grape jelly, her soda breads, and a potato dish called "Champ."

Any of the soda breads make fine accompaniments to soup or salad. They are, however, perhaps best enjoyed the way my grandmother served them — hot with butter (never margarine), homemade jam, and a good pot of tea (made with the water at a rolling boil!).

Any left-over bread can be used to make superb peanut-butter sandwiches — hardly an authentic use, but a pairing so perfect as to excuse the break with tradition.

WHOLE WHEAT SODA BREAD

3 cups whole wheat flour
1 cup all-purpose flour
1 tsp. sugar
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking soda
¾ tsp. baking powder
1½ to 2 cups buttermilk

Stir together dry ingredients until thoroughly combined. Add enough buttermilk to make a soft dough, similar to a biscuit dough.

Turn out onto a lightly floured board and knead lightly for 2 or 3 minutes until quite smooth and velvety-looking. Form into an 8-inch round. Place on a well-buttered baking sheet or 8-inch cake pan. Cut a cross on the top with a sharp, floured knife.

Bake in a preheated 375 degree F. oven for 35 or 40 minutes until it has turned a nice brown and sounds hollow when you tap it with your knuckles. Cool completely before cutting. Makes one loaf.

RAISIN-CARAWAY SEED SODA BREAD

4 cups unbleached flour
1 to 2 tbsp. sugar
1 tsp. salt
¾ tsp. baking soda
¾ tsp. baking powder
1½ cup to 2 cups buttermilk
½ golden or dark raisins (floured lightly)
2 tbsp. caraway seeds

Stir together the first five ingredients. Add enough buttermilk to make a soft dough. Stir in the raisins and caraway seeds.

Turn out onto a lightly floured board and knead for 2 to 3 minutes. Form into an 8-inch round loaf. Place on a well-buttered baking sheet or in a buttered 8-inch cake pan. Cut across on the top with a sharp, floured knife.

Bake in a preheated 375 degree F. oven for 35 to 40 minutes, until brown and sounds hollow when you tap it with

your knuckles. Cool before cutting. Makes one loaf.

CHAMP

6 medium-sized potatoes, pared and quartered
5 tbsp. butter, divided
1 tsp. salt
½ cup milk
4 tender, young green onions, diced (use only the green portion)

Cook the potatoes, covered, in a small amount of boiling, salted water until tender, about 30 minutes. Drain, add milk, 3 tablespoons of the butter, the salt, milk, and green onions. Return to the heat until the butter melts. Mash with a potato masher until free of lumps and creamy. Pile into a heated serving dish. Make an indentation in the top with the back of a spoon; place remaining 2 tablespoons butter in the indentation. Serve steaming hot. Serves 6.

Slow-cook pot tenderizes

Grocery shopping has become such a trauma to most budgets that slow cooking looks even more attractive than ever.

Simmering over low heat for a long period of time tenderizes tougher and less expensive cuts of meat and blends flavors.

Electric slow-cooking pots are boons to this kind of cooking, and to busy homemakers, particularly those who also have careers.

Ingredients can be tossed in the cooker in the morning and, by the time everyone arrives home in the evening, dinner is ready to go on the table. For many of us, that sounds like "almost heaven."

Below are some interesting recipes designed for slow cooking. They are from Margaret Gin's cookbook, "One Pot Meals" (101 Productions, San Francisco), a gem I discovered recently. If your bookstore doesn't have it, write to me and I will give you the publisher's address.

Hope you enjoy these.

POT-AU-FEU

1 beef knuckle bone
1 3-pound beef brisket or rump
1 bay leaf
2 springs parsley
2 springs thyme, or
1 tsp. dried thyme
1 whole plump chicken, about 4 pounds 1 pound chicken giblets
6 carrots, halved
3 leeks, white part only
2 onions, each stuck with 2 cloves
3 turnips, quartered
3 celery ribs with some leaves, halved
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
Accompaniments: pickles and horseradish
French bread and sweet butter

Combine all ingredients with 3 quarts water and cook on low setting in slow cooker, covered, for 8 to 10 hours. When done, put meats and chicken on a platter with the giblets; surround with vegetables and keep warm.

Strain the broth, skimming off fat, and serve separately in cups. Slice meat and serve with the pickles and horseradish. Serve with French bread and butter. Serves 8 to 10 people.

LAMB BAKED WITH TOMATOES AND POTATOES

1 large onion, sliced
2 tbsp. each olive oil and butter
2 pounds boneless lamb, cut into 1-inch cubes
2 sprigs rosemary, chopped, or ½ tsp. dried rosemary
½ cup dry white wine
1 tsp. salt
½ tsp. freshly ground pepper
2 cups peeled, seeded and chopped ripe tomatoes
1¼ pounds new potatoes

Saute onion in olive oil and butter until transparent in a skillet or a slow cooker with a browning unit. Add lamb and rosemary and brown meat on all sides. Cut potatoes into quarters, place in bottom of a slow cooker and top with remaining ingredients. Cook, covered, on low 6 to 8 hours. Serves 6.

POT ROAST, VIENNESE STYLE

1 3½ to 4-pound rump roast or sirloin tip
2 tbsp. butter
1 tsp. salt
½ tsp. freshly ground pepper
1 onion, chopped
2 carrots, chopped
2 turnips, chopped
4 dried figs, chopped
1 cup white wine
1 cup beef stock
8 new potatoes
4 gingersnaps, crushed

Brown meat on all sides in butter in a skillet or a slow cooker with a browning unit. Put carrots, turnips and potatoes in bottom of slow cooker and place roast on top. Add remaining ingredients, except gingersnaps, reducing wine and stock to ¾ cup each. Cover and cook on low 8 to 10 hours. Add gingersnaps and cook on high, uncovered, until thickened.

Hearty main dish salad is appealing

Avocado Taco Salad is a hearty main dish salad filled with delicious crunch, appealing color and good flavor. Use leftover turkey or chicken for added economy.

Remember to buy avocados ahead of time and allow them to ripen at room temperature once they are home. To tell if an avocado is ready to eat, hold it in your hand and give a gentle squeeze. A ripe avocado will yield slightly to the pressure.

AVOCADO TACO SALAD

2 cups shredded lettuce
1 cup cooked kidney beans, drained
1½ cups cubed turkey or chicken
2 large tomatoes, cut in small chunks
2 avocados, peeled and cubed
½ cup chopped onion
2 cups (6 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese
¼ cup canned diced green chilis
Chili dressing (see recipe below)

Chunky soups provide base

Chunky soups are used as a base for these main dishes. They are economical because the meat or fish is in the soup.

CHICKEN PAPRIKA

1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
½ cup sliced green onions
2 tbsp. melted butter
1 19-ounce can chunky chicken soup
1 cup cooked peas
¼ cup sour cream
½ tsp. paprika

Cook mushrooms and green onions in butter until tender. Stir in soup, peas, sour cream and paprika. Heat; stir occasionally. Serve over toast. Makes about 3½ cups. Serves 3.

SEAFOOD ORIENTALE

1 19-ounce can chunky clam chowder soup
1 16-ounce can Chinese vegetables, drained
1 3-ounce can tuna, drained and flaked
¼ tsp. garlic powder

In a saucepan, mix soup, Chinese vegetables, tuna and garlic powder. Heat; stir occasionally. Serve over chow mein noodles with soy sauce. Makes about 3½ cups. Serves 3.

In large serving bowl, layer all ingredients except dressing in order given. Pour dressing over all; toss thoroughly. Serve immediately. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

CHILI DRESSING

½ cup vegetable oil
½ cup red wine vinegar

½ tsp. salt
½ tsp. chili powder
¼ tsp. oregano
¼ tsp. garlic powder

Measure all ingredients into jar with tight-fitting lid. Cover; shake to blend thoroughly. Makes about ¾ cup.

Pontchartrain celebration

Celebrate a special occasion using this recipe from Detroit's Pontchartrain Wine Cellars. Pork chops accented with dill and white wine add a bit of French to your cuisine.

CHOUROUTE GARNIE

6 ¾-inch-thick pork chops
10 slices bacon
6 cups washed sauerkraut
2 tsp. pepper
3 tbsp. dill
2 quarts dry white wine
6 knackwurst
6 unpeeled potatoes, boiled

Line a big kettle with bacon. Place washed sauerkraut on top of bacon slices. Add pork chops and season with pepper and dill. Add just enough dry white wine to cover the ingredients. Put a lid on the kettle and simmer gently for 4 hours. Then add knackwurst and cook 15-20 minutes longer. Arrange sauerkraut on a platter and arrange pork chops and knackwurst on top. Serve with hot boiled potatoes. This makes a good dish to prepare the day before and reheat. Serves 6.

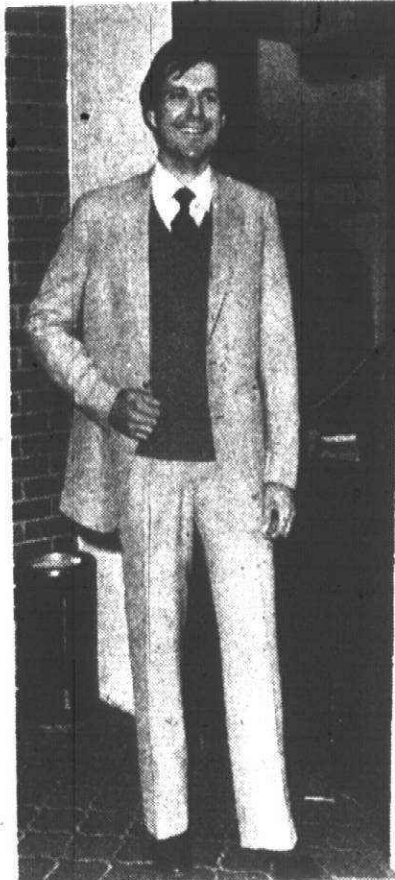

Paradise at one end, treasure buried below

We live in a fast-moving world, so most travelers see only a bridge, its toll booth where cars or taxis pay \$2 for the round-trip toll, and the high-rise skyline of an island.

For most people who visit the Bahamas, this is just another bridge. On the map, it makes a short line from Nassau to Paradise Island, with a small stretch of land called Potter's Cay in the water between.

Tourists cross Paradise Island Bridge all the time, because it takes them to the casinos, restaurants and resort hotels of Paradise Island. The island relates to Nassau in much the same way that Belle Isle relates geographically to Detroit.

People who take time to breathe deeply and slow their cars down will find another world, a genuine travel adventure under the bridge. This is the real Bahamian world of fishing boats, fresh conch out of the shell with lime juice, vegetable markets, and the sea.

LIFE IN THE Bahamas has always been designed by the sea. The early explorers and the pirates made themselves at home among these 700 islands and 2,000 cays spread across the blue-green water of the South Atlantic. The islands share the life of the Caribbean although technically they are still in the South Atlantic.

Columbus was here. Ponce de Leon came this way looking for the Fountain of Youth; his destination was the nearby island of Bimini, but he somehow managed to sail past it to Florida.

The high white prows of modern cruise ships cut through Nassau Harbor regularly to Prince George Wharf, where they dock near the straw market at Rawson Square.

Cruise passengers make regular treks along the coastal highway north to the Paradise Island Bridge. Only a few know enough to get off on the Nassau side and walk across.

What you can see from the top of the bridge is the whole harbor and city skyline of Nassau. You can watch the seaplanes and the glass-bottomed bumboats come into the island.

The cruise ships make a high-masted skyline against the city. At twilight, when the sun backlights the sailboats that make stretched triangles against the sea, you can take travel poster photographs of the harbor.

If you lean over the edge and look down with a telephoto lens, you can photograph the fishing boats and the stalls on Potter's Cay and on the wharf that now ties the cay to the mainland.

POTTER'S CAY is where the housewives of Nassau shop for fresh fruit, vegetables, and fish.

If you have ever bought a single polished conch shell in these warm-water seas, you will be amazed to see a mountain of them rising out of the sea near the fishing docks.

Conch is one of the food staples of the island, and conch lovers eat it raw. It's called Scorch Conch. The fisherman loosens the conch from its shell, scratches the surface of the meat tenderize it in the same way one would cube beef tenderize it. You eat the conch with lime juice and the shell you throw aside on the mountain of shells nearby.

Look closely at the fishing boats and you will see fresh fish swimming, albeit in somewhat jammed conditions, in a water hole at the center of the deck. Most of the fish are grouper, another mainstay of islanders' menus.

This is only a shallow stretch of water between the city and Paradise Island but it is not unusual to see a real fishing drama take place here. While we watched one day, a young fisherman jerked upright as his line began to tug against the side of his boat. What came splashing to the surface was a tarpon, a fish that was almost as big as the fisherman himself.

THE FOOT OF the bridge is also an ideal location for travelers who want to try local Bahamian food. The Bridge Inn has a happy hour that attracts knowing travelers from all over the world, all of whom are willing to be jammed into tables around the small bar. It's an insiders' place. The adjacent dining room serves good Bahamian food.

In that short stretch of East Bay Street that runs east of the Paradise Island Bridge towards the end of the island, you will find several restaurants recommended by local people for good Bahamian food and moderate prices.

The Pilot House Hotel is on the same side of the street at the Bridge Inn. Nearby is the Fish Net. Across from the Pilot House, on the waterfront, you can climb the wooden stairs to the Poopdeck, where your table has a full view of the fishing docks, the harbor, and the bridge.

I recommend the Poopdeck for anyone who likes simple surroundings, good seafood at moderate prices, and a million-dollar view.

Local specialties include conch fritters, conch chowder, conch salad, peas and rice, and grouper fingers.

Paradise Island Bridge is a world of its own. It gives you a very personal view of Nassau. All you need is a little more time to go off the main tourist track and explore.

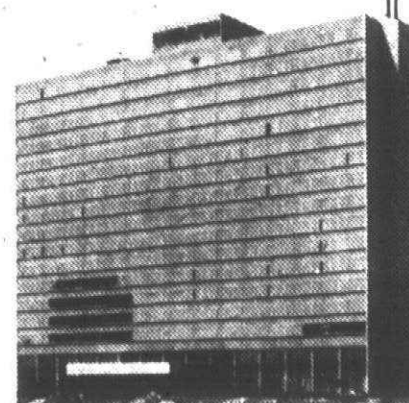

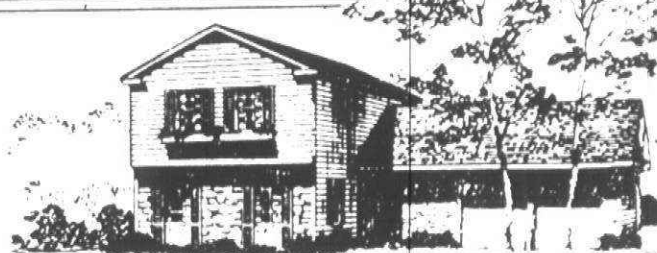
