Zoning ordinance finally becomes law

Canton's zoning ordinance proposal became law at 11 p.m. Tuesday following a 6-1 vote of the township board to approve the 300-page document.

The ordinance carries out the intent of the township's master land use plan. Five years in the making, the document also allows for the proposed and controversial farmland preservation program.

The law took immediate effect following the township board vote as allowed by state zoning law.

Treasurer Jim Donahue called the board vote "the singular most important board action" of the decade.

"It's like finishing a war. You don't know what to do next," said Supervisor Noel Culbert.

Trustee Eugene Daley was the only board trustee who voted against the ordinance approval.

THE ACTION met a self-imposed board deadline to approve the ordinance in March to give the tax board of review an opportunity to lower property assessments of agricultural lands in western Canton.

The agricultural zoning is the most prominent feature of the new law.

The ordinance places 6,200 acres

west of Canton Center in an agricultural-industrial (AGI) zoning district. Land in that classification cannot be split into parcels smaller than 40 acres. Use of the land is limited to agricultural activities.

The ordinance zones an additional 3,000 acres in western Canton for agricultural-residential (AGR) use. Land in the buffer zoning district cannot be split into parcels smaller than five acres.

The Canton Tax Board of Review is expected to reduce property assess-

ments in the AGI district in order to reflect the farming value of the land instead of the potential, developed value. Assessments, which equal about 50 per cent of market value, are the basis of property tax computations.

FOLLOWING A tax board request for township board direction, board trustees indicated their preference for reducing AGI assessments by \$1 million. George McEachran, director of the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation, said the township can reduce the assessments by a maximum \$1 million

without upping property assessments in other areas of the township.

The reduction would mean an average 21 percent decline in AGI property assessments. Trustees said the biggest reductions should be given to active farmers as opposed to land developers who bought land for speculative purposes.

Jim Kosteva, head of the township's planning department, said the assessment reduction will mean an "insignificant" drop in the total tax dollars brought into township hall. The Headlee Amendment will require the township to roll back its millage rate

this year so tax revenues will not increase by more than 12 percent in light of a 17 1/2 percent assessment hike.

Still undecided is a method to fund a development rights program for owners of AGI land. Legally, the township must reimburse landowners for their lost right to develop their land.

The zoning document addresses hundreds of land use issues besides farmland preservation. Among the most controversial is multiple-family zoning along Ford Road to break up that highway's commercial strip.

Court split preferred over combining sites...

Canton Township may take steps to secede from the five-community 35th District Court in a move which backfires on other municipalities' request for a unified courtroom in the district.

Judge James Garber said the action will kill a recommendation of a court

study committee to build one courtroom for Canton Township, Plymouth and Northville Township, Northville and Northville Township.

The recommendation stems from the cost inefficiency of running three courtrooms in the administration buildings of Canton, Plymouth and Northville.

According to Garber, space problems in Plymouth and Northville city halls have forced the court to seek other quarters.

Garber went before Canton board trustees Tuesday night to ask their preference for one of three courthouse sites proposed by the study committee. The committee's recommended site is at Plymouth and Haggerty roads and is owned by the city of Plymouth.

Canton Township officials surprised the judge when they blasted the proposal, which they said was made to "bail out" other communities.

The 5-2 vote to table the construction proposal included a resolution to contact the state Legislature about the possibility of a Canton split from the 35th District.

Canton, which opened its own courtroom in the basement of township hall one year ago, supplies and finances an estimated 40 percent of the district's activities.

"I think it's time that we stop acting like the stepchild of this area and start acting our size," said Trustee Robert Greenstein.

"I'm talking about local area politics for the last 30 years. The psychology is still Plymouth-Canton. Canton now should be predominate."

Trustees offered to deed the district a five-acre parcel on the site of the

... which perturbs others in district

By the time Judge James Garber arrived at the Plymouth Township Board meeting Tuesday night, he needed a few minutes to "cool off."

The 35th District judge was still simmering about the Canton Township Board's decision earlier that evening to form its own court.

Garber had intended simply to ask Plymouth Township officials which of three proposed sites they preferred for the construction of a unified 35th District courthouse to serve five neighboring communities, the cities of Plym-

outh and Northville and the townships of Plymouth, Canton and Northville.

But by about 10 p.m. that evening, Garber's plan appeared to be the last thing on the judge's mind.

What he did talk about was the Canton Board's decision that literally squelched a unified court concept for the five municipalities.

The reaction in Plymouth Township: They were stunned.

"It appears to me you have some empire building down there (in Canton)," said Plymouth Township Supervisor Thomas Notebaert.

Chiefs deny union head's claim

Will local police guard convention?

Two local police chiefs plan to keep their troops close to home during the week of the Republican National Convention in Detroit in July.

That's the reaction from Plymouth's Tim Ford and Canton's Jerry Cox following charges made by a top police labor leader who claims Detroit police officials are hunting for suburban assistance during the big event.

Carl Parsell, head of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM), said Detroit officials may be calling on suburban help to compensate for expected layoffs of 500 Detroit officers.

"Suburban officials should be very careful about rescuing Detroit at the expense of their own citizens," said Parsell, who lives in Plymouth Township and is a former Canton Township treasurer.

He added the arrangements were discussed in "secret talks" between Detroit officials and suburban police chiefs during two area meetings called to "coordinate convention security" last month.

Detroit Police Chief William Hart has not been available for comment.

ACCORDING TO FORD, who attended those meetings, no mention of

such a pact was made to the group of 40-50 area police department heads.

"They just wanted to advise us of their initial planning for the convention. There has been no discussion in relation to providing Plymouth police officers to work in place of Detroit police officers."

"There was no request made to me to supply persons to police the city of Detroit during the convention," added Cox. "I don't know of any plan for suburban officers to go into the city of Detroit."

Cox, however, said he would supply the convention with five officers who have been specially trained in protec-

tion of VIPs. That would only happen, he added, if Congress appropriated extra funding to pay the officers' salaries.

"I think if any direct security would be provided it would be for these individuals to do that job."

Otherwise, both men said they'll have their hands full insuring that local streets are covered during what's expected to be a busy time here. Both expect more activity on the streets because delegates and their families will be lodging in, Plymouth and Canton motels and hotels.

Four hundred Detroit officers already have been laid off. The POAM contract in Detroit expires two weeks

before the start of the convention on July 14.

FORD SAID there are no plans in Plymouth to "beef up" the local staffing during convention activities this summer.

"We do anticipate more activity in the local bars but we can handle just about anything that happens with what we have on the street."

It will not be known until April which delegates will stay in Plymouth and Canton.

Cox says he won't know until then if "extra security measures" will be needed in Canton.

Special elections aren't cheap

Today's special election of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools will cost the school district almost \$10,000.

Almost half of that cost is to pay for precinct workers and to cover the expense of setting up the voting machines.

Florence Beier, administrative assistant for community relations for the district, explained that the election expenses fall into two categories — those required by law and those incurred to inform residents of the ballot issues.

Expenses for items required by law, she said, total almost \$7,880 while the money spent to inform residents was a little more than \$1,900.

EXPENSES in the first category, those required by law, include: \$1,800 to print up the ballots; \$2,579 to set up the voting machines; \$500 to move the machines from where they are stored to where they will be used; and about \$3,000 for precinct workers.

The \$3,000 figure is higher than previous elections as the district is required to pay precinct workers minimum wage and the minimum wage has increased since the last election.

Ms. Beier pointed out that the district also spends money for printed material to inform residents about the ballot proposals. By state law, she said, it is illegal for any material distributed

by the district to support a position, either for or against a ballot issue.

"We were very careful to make sure that none of the material was slanted, and we certainly didn't urge anyone to vote yes or no."

THE INFORMATIONAL expenses item includes \$206 to print precinct maps which were distributed to elementary and middle school students to take to their parents.

The community relations office also prepared a brochure explaining the ballot proposals which was mailed to every house in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The printing cost for that brochure

was \$732 and the cost of postage was \$812.

"We also had a question-answer flier which was included in school newsletters sent home and passed out at public meetings. The cost of printing the flier was \$156."

The informational expenses for the election totalled \$1,906. When added to the \$7,879 for items legally required, the total cost to the school district for the election is \$9,785.

The citizens election committee is using volunteers to man a phone center urging residents to get out and vote, but that committee does not plan on spending any money on the campaign.

Secretaries pact remains unsettled

Final agreement is yet to be reached with the union representing secretaries employed by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The school board had been prepared to vote Monday night to approve a contract if the secretaries had ratified. But the item was deleted from the agenda when it was learned the secretaries hadn't voted yet on ratification.

Members of the Plymouth-Canton Association of Educational Office Personnel also met Monday night to hear about the proposed settlement.

Although tentative agreement was reached at the bargaining table, the proposed settlement went to the membership without the recommendation of the union negotiators. Ratification was recommended by state mediator Robert Whittaker.

A meeting has been scheduled by the union for this Monday to take a ratification vote. If ratified, the school board then will vote on the proposed settlement at its April 14 meeting.

If agreement is reached with the secretaries, bus drivers and teachers would be working without a ratified contract.

The program is produced and presented by upperclassmen at the CEP who are enrolled in the two-part, full-year course, Humanities I and II.

The class is offered at Plymouth Salem High and is taught by Nancy Koppin, Ruth Tonner and Sue Welker.

THROUGHOUT THE year, students have the option of either preparing a showcase in the school building or presenting a 60-minute program to be broadcast on the school radio station.

The students, working in groups, prepare their information through research and organization many weeks before air-time.

Research topics range from the Renaissance to the modern era. The information is brought to the listener through simulated interviews with people of the past.

The simulated interviews cover background about their lives, presentations with music, and many other innovative techniques.

Kathie Allen, WSDP staff advisor and coordinator of the program, said: "The show gives both students and listeners an excellent opportunity to be involved in history."

The program is broadcast at 7 p.m. Tuesdays.

During the fall semester the students studied the days of primitive man, Greek and Roman history, and the middle ages. This semester they began with the Renaissance era and will cover different time periods up to the modern era.

Upcoming topics include art and music from the late Baroque era, politics in the Enlightenment, Romanticism during the 18th Century, and psychological advancements of the Victorian era. Later in the series the students will present humanities topics prevalent in the modern era.

Samuel Stout of First United Methodist Church of Plymouth. Burial was in Rural Hill Cemetery, Northville.




township administration building at Canton Center and Proctor for a courthouse.

But Garber, who said the offer was never made during the study committee's deliberations, said a Canton site would be unacceptable to Northville and Northville Township because of the distance.

Garber said the study committee

preferred the site in the City of Plymouth because of its location at the center of the 35th District and its tax-exempt status.

The committee is considering two other sites — at Joy and Haggerty in Plymouth Township and at Joy and Morton Taylor in Canton Township. Robinson Rental Co. owns the Plymouth Township site, while Practical

Homebuilders owns the parcel in Canton.

Garber said all three landowners have agreed to finance the estimated \$1.3 million cost of building the courthouse. The landowners would lease the building to the court for about 25 years, when the deed would be transferred to the 35th District.

GARBER MAINTAINS that a uni-

fied courthouse would increase efficiency of the court and curtail rising district costs.

He said a decision on the unified courthouse is needed within the next few weeks because of City of Plymouth plans for bond-financed expansion of the municipal building where a 35th District courtroom is located. The city, which has delayed the bond sale pending a courthouse decision, must float the bonds soon because of Headlee Amendment stipulations.

Garber said officials of Plymouth and Northville townships have indicated a desire for a courthouse in their municipalities if a unified courthouse is not built.

The judge maintains that court costs will remain at this year's estimated level of \$500,000 if the unified courtroom is built. He said costs will rise if separate courtrooms are maintained because of a need for additional clerks and rising telephone bills.

Each community within the 35th District finances court operations on the basis of caseload. Garber estimates that Canton will pay \$220,000 this year.

CANTON OFFICIALS admit that they have never researched the costs of supporting their own court district. Greenstein, an attorney, maintains that municipalities with their own district are operating their courts at a profit.

"I think you're wrong," Garber said. "I sincerely believe that you'd be better off as a member of the 35th District Court."

Garber, the presiding judge of Canton's 35th District courtroom, was visibly upset over the board's reaction to the construction project. A Plymouth Township resident for the past 23 years, Garber said he would be forced to move to Canton in order to retain his judicial position there.

"We're sorry to kill this (construction proposal)," said Treasurer Jim

Donahue. "But I think this township's best interests are served if Canton splits off."

Clerk John Flodin, Canton's representative on the court study committee, voted against the board's motion to research a split from the 35th District along with Trustee Eugene Daley.

Flodin said he told committee members that he personally personally favored a unified courthouse but was unable to speak on behalf of the township board.

"This award is a tribute to the teamwork and outstanding professional skills of the Edmands' staff," said Donald Trim, Wade-Trim president.

"We are proud that their work has received this prestigious award."

Trim said the project now qualified for consideration of a national award

by the American Consulting Engineers Council. Winners will be announced in May.

The 950-foot main, installed across the bottom of the river, represents approximately one-third of the Bay Metropolitan water system's river crossing capacity. It replaced a defective main that had been inoperable because of leaking sections. Water use restriction had been enacted in the Bay City area after the defective main became inoperable.

The project was completed on time with the total cost \$20,000 below estimate.

'AAA' clerk charged with taking \$47,000

A Westland woman employed at the Automobile Club of Michigan branch in Plymouth Township Tuesday was charged with embezzling \$47,741 in license plate tab fees.

Alison Kase, 52, stood mute at an arraignment before Judge Dunbar Davis of the 35th District Court in Plymouth Tuesday and was released on a \$1,000 personal bond. An exam is set for April 10 before Judge Davis.

Employed with the company for 17 years, Mrs. Kase worked as a supervisor at the AAA branch at 44511 Ann Arbor Road at Sheldon. According to State Police Sgt. James Collins, she was the office supervisor since the branch opened.

Mrs. Kase was suspended from her

job by the company Feb. 12 after an internal audit discovered a shortage of funds, according to a company spokesperson. Collins says the audit was initiated Jan. 10 when it was discovered license plate fees for one day were not turned in.

Collins would not say over how long a period of time the reported shortage covered.

He says the office on Ann Arbor Road reports some \$10,000 in license plate fees collection each day.

Robert Ziolkowski, a Detroit attorney, is representing Mrs. Kase. He was not available for comment.

The embezzlement charge is a felony that carries a maximum 10-year sentence.

Bus leader's grievance denied

A grievance filed by a leader of the bus driver's union was denied Monday by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Alice Horstead was suspended for one day for using abusive language in a discussion with administrator Walter Bartnick, chief negotiator for the school board.

The incident occurred during private discussions and was not related to negotiations, according to both sides at that time.

The grievance protested the action taken and asked for restoration of the day's pay lost.

In denying the grievance the board also denied the relief restoration of the day's pay.

No details were given as the employee had requested a closed hearing on the grievance.

The school board voted 5-2 to deny the grievance. Trustees Richard Arlen and Flossie Tonda dissented.

Union opposes private ambulances

Plymouth Township firefighters this week opposed plans to allow a private ambulance firm to operate in the township.

To cut costs in the fire department, township officials recently began investigating contracting with Novi Ambulance Co. for emergency service. The fire department's budget this year is \$540,000.

Calling such a move "an unnecessary step backward in this critical service to the community," firefighter Chuck VanVleck said the move would reduce the quality of service presently provided and would directly cost residents for emergency help.

"We're very proud of our record," said the union president. "And it's a slap in the face when the township even considers going to a private ambulance."

"The idea of a private contract is

cheaper in their budget, but it doesn't help the guy out there who needs an ambulance."

In the Northville community, where Novi Ambulance now operates, the community paid the firm \$2,800 last year as a retainer fee. Residents who used the service paid about \$85 for transport to a hospital to \$285 for transportation and medical attention.

Emergency transport and medical attention by township firefighters currently is free of charge to residents. Officials have not yet determined what kind of cost-saving could be realized by eliminating or reducing the township rescue service.

"CONTRARY TO statements made before, most hospitalization plans do not pay for ambulance services and if they do it is a set rate," VanVleck said.

"The township's own hospitalization

plan does not pay for any ambulance service."

The union official also said such a service would threaten "mutual aid" pacts with other municipalities. Under such pacts, neighboring communities voluntarily come to one another's assistance during emergencies.

"The fire departments in this area have a mutual aid agreement that would provide extra ambulances to us when needed. A private ambulance company does not have this benefit."

Rising overtime costs in the fire department are one incentive to alter the service, according to township officials.

Also, the traditional role of a municipal fire department — fighting fires — has been replaced to a large extent by the transport of sick residents as well as emergency medical assistance to those in accidents.

Fire Chief Larry Groth estimates that rescue runs account for about 90 percent of a firefighter's workload.

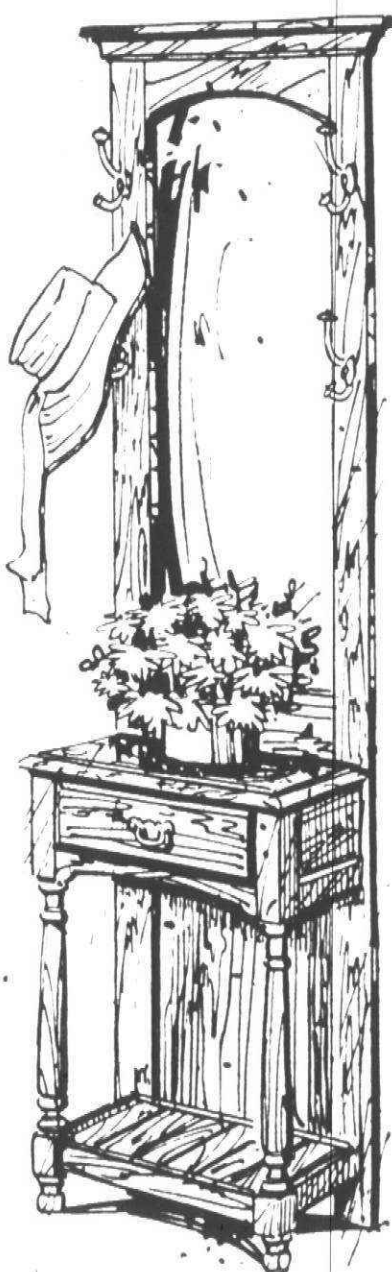
Equipment needed for emergency service, such as medical supplies and rescue rigs, are costly. A new rescue vehicle now costs about \$35,000.

Staffing such vehicles, under state requirements, also is a costly venture, officials said. Each unit responding to an emergency call for help must now be staffed with a licensed driver as well as a licensed medical technician (EMT).

Call-back of off-duty officers to fill in at stations left vacant by officers on emergency runs accounts for some overtime expense.

The union is proposing the township hire additional officers to counter overtime expense.

The township now employs 15 firefighters at two stations.

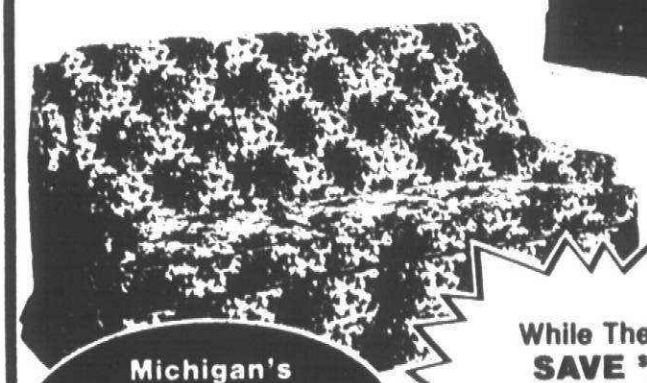

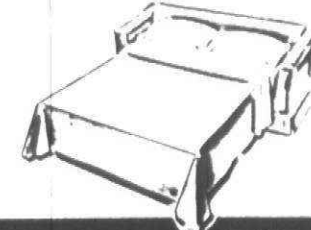

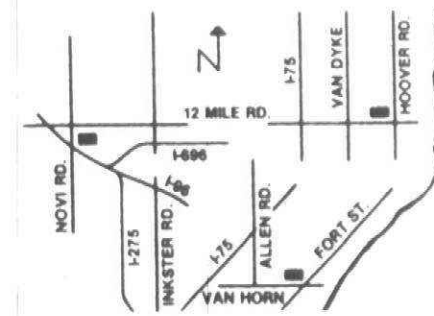

State backs moratorium on cutting hospital beds

A joint administrative rules committee of the state Legislature on Tuesday called unanimously for a 90-day moratorium on implementing plans to trim hospital beds.

Legislators asked for the moratorium in a resolution, which is not lawfully binding on the planning group. But state Rep. Wilbur Brotherton, R-Farmington, warned that "if it's necessary for the committee to introduce a bill to give it binding effect, we've agreed to do it."

"It's a matter of intent in both houses (of the Legislature)," he added. Brotherton's comment was greeted by cheers at a meeting of the Michigan Association of Community Hospitals and Physicians Tuesday night at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

The state house and senate also agreed to establish a committee to study the Comprehensive Health Planning Council (CHPC) of Southeastern Michigan during the moratorium. CHPC is a private, non-profit group funded by the federal government and mandated by the state to devise a plan to reduce the number of hospital beds in Michigan.

The rules committee also rejected 1980 guidelines and criteria for bed-bidding as proposed by the CHPC. Some observers say that action delayed the bed-bidding plan, at least temporarily.

But the effect of that decision is under debate.

"I'm not sure there should be any cheering yet," said Brotherton. "Some say the decision applies only to the coming year so that last year's rules and guidelines are still in effect until new ones are approved."

"And those are the ones that got us in trouble," he added.

Brotherton said that the State Health Coordinating Council (SHCC), which is charged with responsibility for overseeing the plans, is expected to ask for a state attorney general's opinion on "what the action really means."

A lobbyist hired by the community hospital association said that the action was required because of a 30-day time limit for approving the guidelines. If the rules committee hadn't acted, the guidelines would automatically have been approved.

Correction

K of C ready to launch mental health fund drive

The Knights of Columbus in Plymouth will launch its fifth annual fund drive tomorrow to assist mental health programs.

A Tootsie Roll sale will be conducted Friday, Saturday and Sunday by members of the Fr. Victor J. Renaud Knights of Columbus with assistance from members of the National Honor Society of the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP).

Last year, statewide, the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic men's fraternal society, collected more than \$500,000 during the three-day weekend drive. Locally some \$6,000 was collected and donated to the Plymouth Opportunity Center, said local council Grand Knight Donald German.

UNDER THE PROGRAM, which is carried out in most of the 202 K of C councils in Michigan, people are asked to donate money to go toward mental health programs and, in return, are given a Tootsie Roll candy in appreciation of the gift.

Eighty percent of the net income from the donations is retained by the local council for distribution to area groups and agencies, said German.

The balance is forwarded to the State Council of the Knights of Columbus to meet expenses and make donations in behalf of all the 65,000 Knights in Michigan.

A principal beneficiary of the State Council funds is the State Association for the Mentally Retarded Citizens.

Other gifts also are given to organizations assisting individuals with mental health problems.

Victor Gustafson, chairman of the local fund-raising campaign, said there are more than 265,000 mentally retarded residents in Michigan and the donations will go towards lessening their handicaps through training and professional services.

"The donations to local organizations in the first four years of the program by K of C councils in behalf of their contributors proved to be a gratifying experience for our members who are asked to practice Christian charity as a principle of their membership," said German. "We are looking forward to even greater participation this weekend."

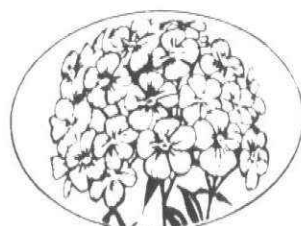

Retirement manuscript is selected for honor

A manuscript on retirement decisions written by a Canton resident has been singled out for an honor by the Detroit Chapter of the National Association of Accountants.

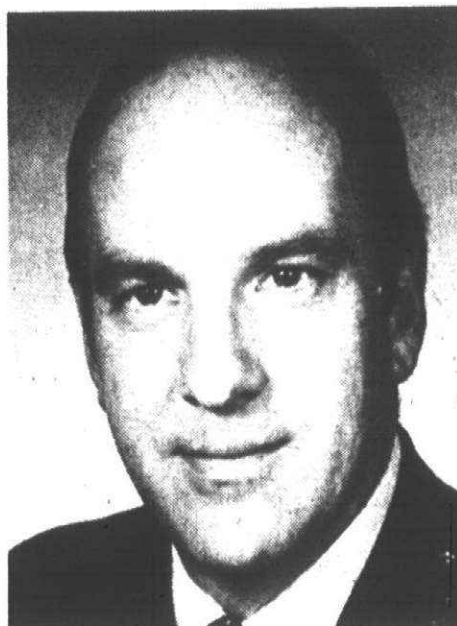

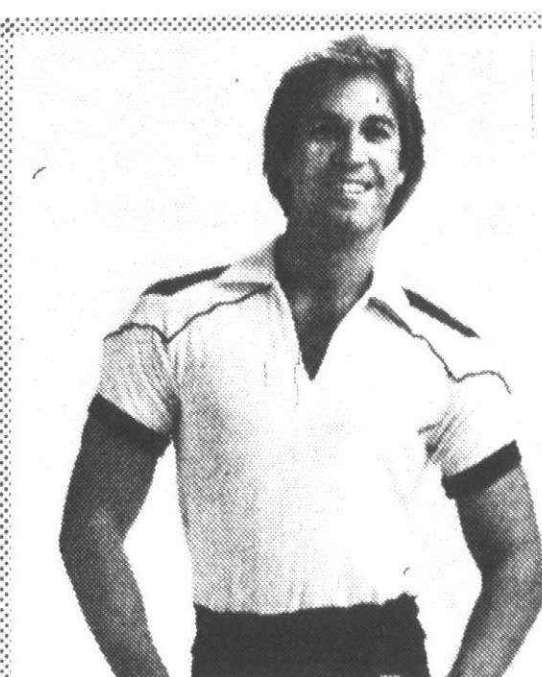

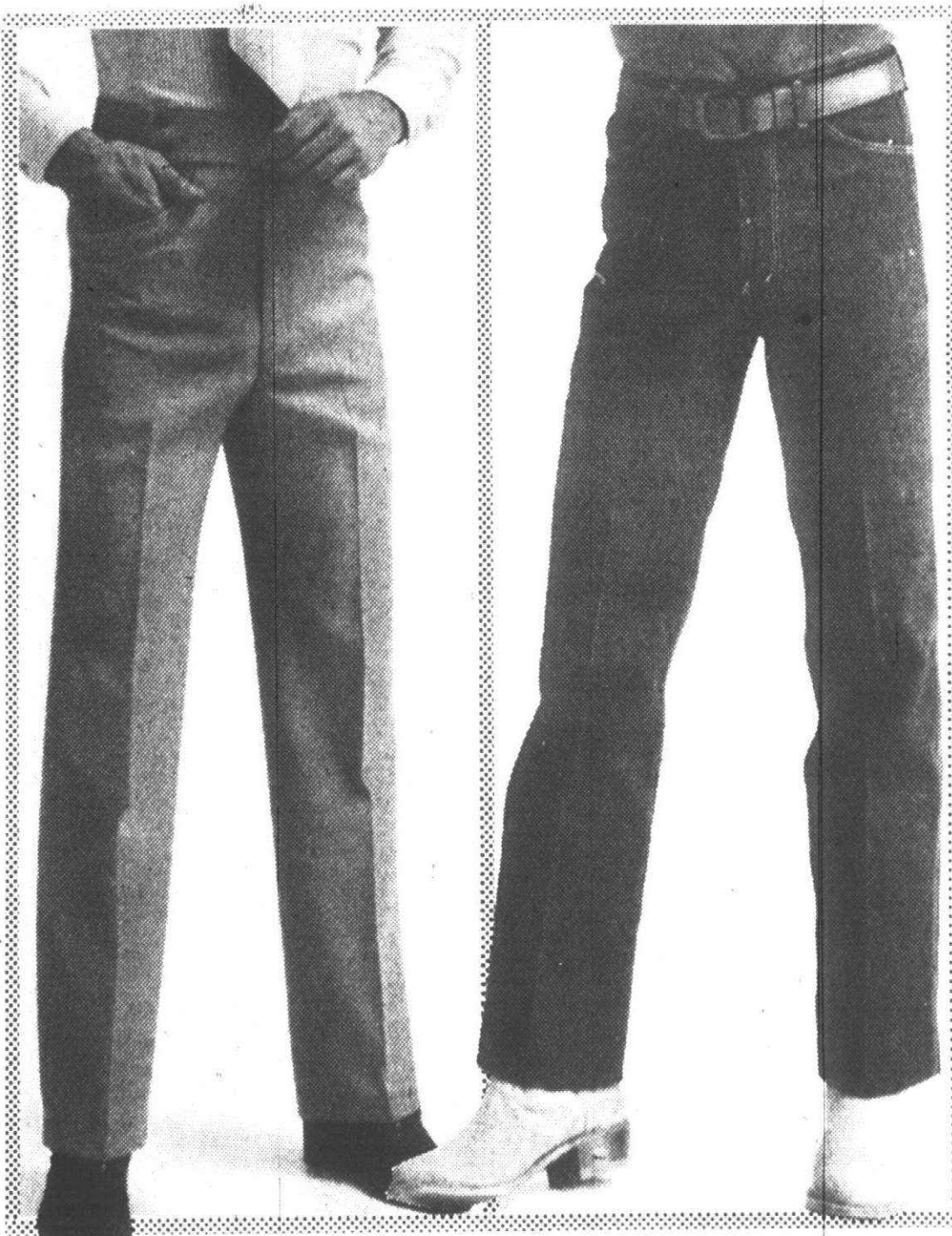

When traveling abroad, try to learn the language

(The writer, a Plymouth resident, local historian and author of "Plymouth Past and Present," is wintering in southern France. This column is another in a series of how people can travel around Europe on a limited budget.)

One way to occupy your day during an extended visit to a foreign country is to attempt to learn the language.

You can take private lessons, or you can attend a school or college where you will study with a group. I prefer the latter.

It is much cheaper, and you have the added advantage of making the acquaintance of people from a variety of foreign countries. In such a group, you have at least one thing in common: You are all novices in the language of the country you are visiting. That circumstance promotes a warm and friendly ambience not usually felt when total strangers get together.

For example, in the French class I attend at College International in Cannes, the 12 students are from Holland, Germany, Japan, Denmark, Ireland, England, Iran, Brazil, the United States (me), and Canada (three). Seven are male, five female.

They range in age from two boys in their early teens to an old duffer who will never see 60 again (that's me as well).

THE PROFESSOR, a young Frenchwoman, has her master's degree from the Sorbonne. We attend class three hours a day, five days a week, from 9 a.m. to noon.

A few days ago we had a party in the classroom. The occasion was to mark the departure from school of the man from Iran of whom I wrote in a previous column.

As this is being written, the Iranian is in a hospital bed in Chicago. He left for the United States the day after we had the party.

He recently discovered that he has a heart problem. His French doctor sent his "dossier" to a doctor in Chicago, who happens to be the Iranian's brother-in-law. He was told to leave immediately for the U.S. for a heart by-pass operation.

On the day of the party, we devoted the first half of the morning to writing an examination paper. We were tested every Friday to determine what progress we have made in our comprehension of such things as the gender of French nouns (milk is a masculine noun, and beer is feminine), the placement of adjectives, the formation of adverbs, and

the conjunction of French verbs.

The Iranian took the exam and listened to the professor's corrections as though he had nothing else on his mind that day other than the mysteries of French grammar.

DURING THE final 1½ hours, we had the pot-luck party. Each student had been asked to bring something to eat and something to drink.

The German youth, from Heidelberg, brought a box of biscuits, a bottle of champagne, and an extremely efficient German corkscrew. As usual, however, the bubbly stuff spurted out and over the floor when opened.

The Iranian brought a large box of French pastries — eclairs, Napoleons, cream puffs — quite expensive, very appetizing, and loaded with calories. He also passed around a bag of pistachio nuts.

The young boy from Brazil brought a gigantic bottle of Coca-Cola. He was actually born in the U.S., but has lived most of his life in South America, Spain and France. Although he is a U.S. citizen, he's unable to read or write English, because he left America with his parents when he was an infant. He, and the young Canadian boy, polished off the Coke in no time at all.

The young Canadian brought a bag of apples, oranges and bananas.

A young man from Ireland, whose father brought the family to France after selling his toothpaste tube factory in Tipperary, brought a bottle of white wine, a package of Ritz crackers, and a tin of caviar. He proceeded to share them with one and all.

THE IRISH youth is a bit of a cut-up in class.

When the instructor is out of the room, he teases the English girl by writing "Up the I.R.A." on the black board. She always erases it, replacing it with "Up the Brits."

But the Irishman is nobody's fool. After he had liberally slathered the first cracker with caviar, he went down the hall to present it to the Frenchwoman who directs the college.

Others in the class brought cheese, bread, crackers and cold meats.

All, except the two youths, brought a bottle of wine. At the start I counted 10 bottles in the classroom, including champagne, Cinzano, red, white and rose wine.

The professor began the party by reminding us to speak French. "C'est pas une reception Anghais." Between mouthfuls of food and of wine imbibed from makeshift aluminum cups, we did our best to comply.

We toasted the Iranian, wished him "Bon Chance," and told him to hurry back. The professor passed out song sheets, in French of course, and led us in a French drinking song, "Sacre Bouteille" (Holy Bottle).

When we finished at noon, there was plenty of food left, and four or five bottles of wine still unopened. We had a good time in spite of the marked differences in ages, nationalities, and backgrounds.

AS HE DROVE me home for the last time (I shall have left France when he returns), the Iranian told me he feared the heart operation which faced him in the U.S.

"I have responsibilities, a wife and three children."

With my limited knowledge of French, I did my best to allay his fears, citing the many heart by-pass operations which have been successful in the United States. As I left the car, I wished him good luck and bon voyage.

His last word was the same farewell he had used every school day when I left his car at the corner of Boulevard Carnot and Rue Milton. Not French, nor English, nor Farsi, the language of Iran.

"Ciao," he replied, minus the Italian accent, as I closed the car door.

Commercial taxes used for a variety of purposes

Every year when assessments are adjusted is heard the time-honored question: "What do we get for our taxes?"

Along with this question, some critics point to the commercial areas of the city and suggest they aren't really too helpful because they require expenditure of tax funds for services but pay very little for what they get.

This criticism annually surfaces in Plymouth. But a study of the city's tax rolls furnishes a different story. And that story might prompt the business community to ask, "What do we get for our taxes?"

THE STUDY of the tax figures furnished by Ken Way, city treasurer/assessor, shows that the commercial segments pay more in property taxes than the city's industries.

All commercial properties in the city are assessed at \$22,704,000 and pay taxes in the amount of \$277,965 to the city.

For services they receive fire and police protection when needed, and rubbish collection three times a week (to be reduced to twice-weekly in July).

They also have access to water mains and sewers, which are paid for separately and constructed with funds raised through special assessments rather than from the property tax.

Unlike residential neighborhoods, businesses have to provide their own

parking for customers or for their employees if located near municipal lots.

THE TAXES businesses pay to the city go into the general fund to finance operations.

Besides the city millage on commercial property, the school district, county, and other governmental agencies such as Schoolcraft also collect property tax revenues from local businesses.

As one of the business leaders in the city remarked, "We help to provide the good schools that attract new residents to the city. Cities are best known for the type of schools they provide and we help to keep Plymouth high in the ratings."

"More than that, our business places attract people from other areas and that helps to make Plymouth a prosperous city."

The city of Plymouth is only 2.5 square miles and little of that space is zoned for industry. The residential tax burden is heavier than the commercial and industrial sections because most land is residential.

Using the 1979 tax figures, the residential assessment, as equalized by the state, was \$60,241,000 which produced \$737,530 in revenue.

Meanwhile commercial properties were assessed and equalized at \$22,704,500 and the tax income generated amounted to \$277,965.

Industrial property was assessed and equalized at \$19,279,500 and generated

\$263,039 in property tax revenues to the city.

The entire state equalized valuation of the city was \$102,224,500 which produced local revenue from the property tax of \$1,278,435 for the city alone.

The city's millage levy was: 12.243 for operation, 2.784 for debt service, and 1.423 for refuse collection for a total levy of 16.45.

Farmers—Don't complain, campaign for office

The people most affected by Canton's farmland preservation proposal should draw a red circle around the date June 3.

That's the last day for township board candidates to file nominating petitions at township hall.

It's the farmers' last opportunity until 1984 to attempt expression of their views where viewpoints count the most politically — on the township board.

Farmland preservation has evolved into Canton's hottest political issue during the last four years.

Yet, farmers have stood on the sidelines to watch subdivision dwellers seek the elected positions where decisions are made. They have assumed an

advisory role at best while persons not familiar with farming problems formulate proposals to buy development rights and preserve the township's agricultural land.

A long-time farmer recently underscored the lack of representation at a planning commission hearing. He asked planning commissioners to identify their place of residence during discussion of a zoning ordinance proposal which places some 5,000 acres west of Canton Center in a permanent agricultural district.

THE FARMER'S point was well made.

No one on the seven-member township board or planning commission is an active farmer. Only two officials — Trustee Robert Greenstein and Planning Commissioner Robert Padgett — reside in western Canton. But the farming community cannot complain about lack of representation if none of its members seek an active role in township government.

A voice is more important now than ever. Expected approval of Canton's proposed zoning ordinance will lock thousands of acres into agricultural use while township officials continue their funding search for a compensatory, development

rights program. Some say that Canton's farmland should be exempted from some land use requirements such as fence permits and set-back stipulations in order to promote agricultural activities.

No one knows more about the farmer's need than the farmer. Ignoring the June 3 filing date will mean continued formulation of agricultural policy by non-farmers.

Waiting another four years may be too late for farmers to attain a significant voice in their future. The fate of the agricultural program may be decided by the time candidates line up in 1984.

School board hopefuls need commitment

After the last vote is counted in today's special bond issue election, school election workers will turn their attention to another balloting deadline.

That's because April 7 is the deadline to file nominating petitions to run as a candidate for the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education in the annual election on June 9.

So if your interest in education has been sparked by today's special election, or by any other educational issue during the past year, April 7 is an important date for you. And it's only 11 days away.

But those 11 days do provide enough time to gather and file nominating petitions if you are interested in serving on the school board. Not that many signatures are needed to gain nomination. In fact, a petition can be circulated in one day.

In June two incumbents — Richard Arlen and Flossie Tonda — are up for re-election. Whoever is elected will serve for four years.

A PERSON thinking about serving on the school board should, however, have more than an interest in education.

A board candidate also should be willing to commit the time needed to participate in decision-making and to represent residents of the Plymouth-Canton community.

Being a school trustee requires a minimum of about eight to 10 hours a week. If you can't find that time on your calendar now, don't pick up any petitions. A good trustee, committed to doing the best possible job, will spend 12-20 hours a week.

A good school trustee must be willing to serve the entire community — not just one municipality, one neighborhood, or one special interest.

A good trustee must be interested in all of the problems and challenges facing public education today, rather than being concerned about only one or two aspects of the school district.

If you have the time, and the correct motives, pick up nominating petitions this week from the board offices at 354 S. Harvey in the city of Plymouth.

THE CURRENT school board is pretty well balanced as a representative sample of the community.

Three trustees live in Canton, three live in Plymouth Township, and one lives in the city of Plymouth. Four are women and three are men. Two have backgrounds in business and finance, one is an educator, and four are homemakers who came up through the ranks of the PTAs, citizen advisory groups, and study committees.

You will want to look at your particular talents or expertise and consider whether your presence on the board will make it more representative of the community or add to the decision-making process.

Give some serious thought to running for the school board. But not for too long. April 7 is the deadline to return petitions.

Another important date, in case you are a new resident, is May 12 — the deadline to register to vote. To cast a ballot in the June 9 election you must register by 5 p.m. May 12 — either at the board office or with the municipal clerk of your place of residence.

A final important deadline is 8 p.m. today. If you haven't cast your vote yet in today's bond issue election, get in line. Every vote counts — especially yours.

You don't see spats any more. But there was a time when they were all the rage and a bit of high fashion. And the oxfords we wear now throughout the year were unheard of during the winter.

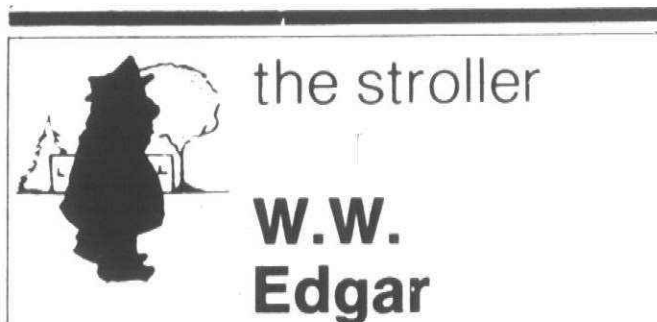
ANOTHER LISTENER asked, "Do you remember the old-time celluloid collar?"

Watch out for politics

The more you think about it, the more depressing it gets.

Last week the Wayne County Board of Commissioners made an appointment to the three-member road commission. There were two chief candidates.

One was backed by Buddy Battle, a United Auto Workers regional honcho from Detroit. The other was backed by Bard Young, UAW regional honcho down Taylor way. The vote was 15-12 for Bard Young's candidate.

Young's candidate — the first female member of the road commission — is herself a UAW staffer.

And that's what so much of Wayne County politics boils down to: a political outlet for The Union.

NOW SUPPOSE we had a county manager. A county manager would be appointed by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

What level of statesmanship do you think would be displayed during the appointment process? Would there be national advertising for a professional manager, as Garden City, Plymouth and Farmington Hills do when they're in the market for a city manager?

Very doubtful. It would be low politics. I raise the issue, depressing as it is, because some critical timing is necessary.

Within the next couple of weeks, the Wayne County Board of Commissioners will vote on the question of placing a charter commission on the ballot.

Under the present timing, charter commissioners would be elected from districts drawn after the 1970 census. At that time, Detroit had 1.5 million residents and the rest of the county just under one million.

Such a charter commission would be Detroit-dominated.

IF THE PROCESS were delayed, figures from the 1980 census — which occurs officially next Tuesday — would be used to apportion the charter commission.

In the last decade, Detroit has lost about 5,000 occupied dwelling units every year. That's about 50,000 units for the decade.

So the city's population loss has to be several hundred thousand. My guess is that the total will come in at 1.1 to 1.2 million. Others say it may be below one million.

Meanwhile, Livonia, Westland, Plymouth, Northville and especially Canton and other western suburbs have grown. It's a safe bet that the out-county's population will exceed Detroit's. In any event, it will be an even match.

That would change the balance of power on the charter commission.

MOST OUT-COUNTY commissioners, who presumably reflect the thinking of their districts, would prefer to have an elected county executive.

Buddy Battle and Bard Young would be able to back one candidate or another, but the ultimate decision would be up to us, the voters.

The Detroit contingent, if I may oversimplify, will be supportive of a county manager. It wants no rival to Detroit's mayor.

Someone must get a handle on Wayne County's administration, which is more concerned with protecting jobs and salaries than with serving the public and balancing its budget.

With a county executive, we might just have a chance.

A group called Wayne County Communities for Equal Representation is trying to stall the charter commission process just long enough to get 1980 census figures used in the apportionment process.

That may sound dull and technical to the average voter. But if we are to stop Wayne County from being the laughing stock of the state and nation, we should pay attention.

angle is low, and back-lighting gives the halo effect around the boys' heads.

Did you know that children are the most photographed of all subjects? Only a photograph can provide an enduring record of the growth and activities of a child.

Because these pictures will grow more meaningful and priceless as time goes by, the photographer must use the utmost care and attention to portray the precious times of childhood.

Most important in photographing children is capturing the spirit of childhood. Infants, of course, are unaware of the camera and their "spirit" is easily obtained.

But as children reach the age of four or five, they become very aware of the presence of a camera and do not respond well to posing directions. Stiff poses and artificial expressions will tend to replace a natural look, and it is only after the camera is put away that the child's naturalness returns.

But if a child is enjoying a toy or an activity of his own choosing, he becomes unaware of the camera and capturing the child's "spirit" will be easy.

So the first and most important thing to remember in successful child photography is to concentrate on candid pictures.

The unplanned and the unexpected provide the opportunity for that exceptional photograph of your child. The objective is to capture the fleeting expression and momentary action rather than to attempt to pose the situation.

Here are some related tips to help you get better shots of your children:

- **Use a telephoto lens.** By using a medium telephoto lens (about 100-200 mm), you can keep your distance and not intrude on your child's activity. He may not even know you are there.

- **Use an assistant.** A helper will be a source of distraction and can coax a happy, natural expression from the child.

- **Get on the child's level.** Lower the level of the camera - even get down on the floor! Children live in a world of giant adults and huge surroundings. By getting low, you can capture a child's perspective and greatly improve your pictures.

- **Use outdoor lighting.** Overcast days provide the best lighting for "people" pictures. The lighting is soft, and harsh shadows are eliminated. On sunny days position yourself so that the sun is behind your subject and use a flash to fill in the shadows.

- **Use indoor lighting.** Natural light from a window can be very pleasing. Or, use a bounce flash to get softer, more even illumination.

- **Use fast film.** For outdoor candid shots, use a fast film. This will enable you to preset the camera at a small lens opening to increase depth of field. Also, set the camera at a fast shutter speed to be ready to catch a fleeting expression or freeze a child's leap in air.

By photographing children naturally you'll be able to capture the spirit of youth that your family and friends will enjoy for many years to come.

3 little girls 3 - down the church aisle

Three little girls. Three. Every schoolday morning just as the clock's hands marked 8:15, the bouncing 6-year-old identical triplets would prance down the church aisle for mass.

The last individual thing they did in life was their moment of birth. Once they joined hands, they never let go.

My father would watch them from his vantage point in the organ loft. With impeccable timing, Daddy would shape his bubble gum to blow a gigantic bubble the instant they turned to look up, much to the consternation of the sisters who instructed the children in proper etiquette.

Daddy was the Peter Pan among church organists, as much of a kid as those seated downstairs in the church.

The morning the bubble burst, veiling Daddy's face in gum, the triplets collapsed in each other's arms, their laughter ringing throughout the church

and sending the nuns scurrying to chastise both Daddy and the giggling children.

OCCASIONALLY, the triplets would skip up the stairs to the organ loft to chuckle over a knock-knock joke Daddy would whisper or watch wide-

eyed as his fingers would glide over the organ keyboard.

After school, the trio could be seen, hands glued, jumping over sidewalk cracks on their way home.

Whenever they chose to lolligag, sharing deep, dark secrets, the two girls walking on the outside would always incline their head to rest on the center sister's shoulders. Together. Always together.

THEN CAME the summer when polio still stalked the streets searching for unprotected victims; the summer when iron lungs no longer appeared in the newspapers as current events, yet people hesitated to obtain the new vaccine.

Somewhere that summer, polio found three little girls. As always, together.

I stood beside Daddy in the organ loft the morning two tiny white caskets were gradually moved down the aisle. His voice broke continuously as

Daddy attempted to sing the Mass of the Angels. He couldn't bear to look downstairs, so Daddy sat behind the organ during the service, his face buried in his hands.

"Why?" Daddy questioned. "What's going to happen to the little one left all alone? How will she ever live without the others?"

Daddy wasn't in church the morning his question was answered. A severe heart attack had kept him bed-ridden for several months, and I was sitting at the organ in his place.

It was 8:15 on a schoolday morning when I saw her. Slowly, painfully she moved down the aisle, her crippled legs encased in steel braces. Her small body lifting itself laboriously on the crutches.

One little girl. One.

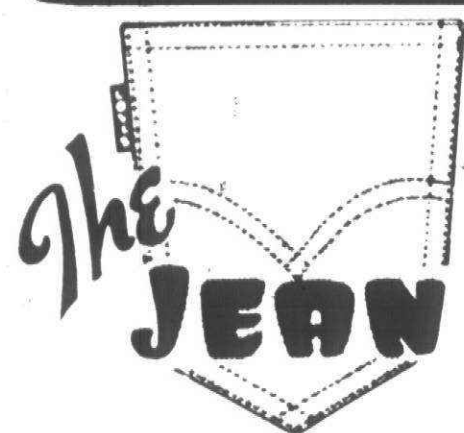
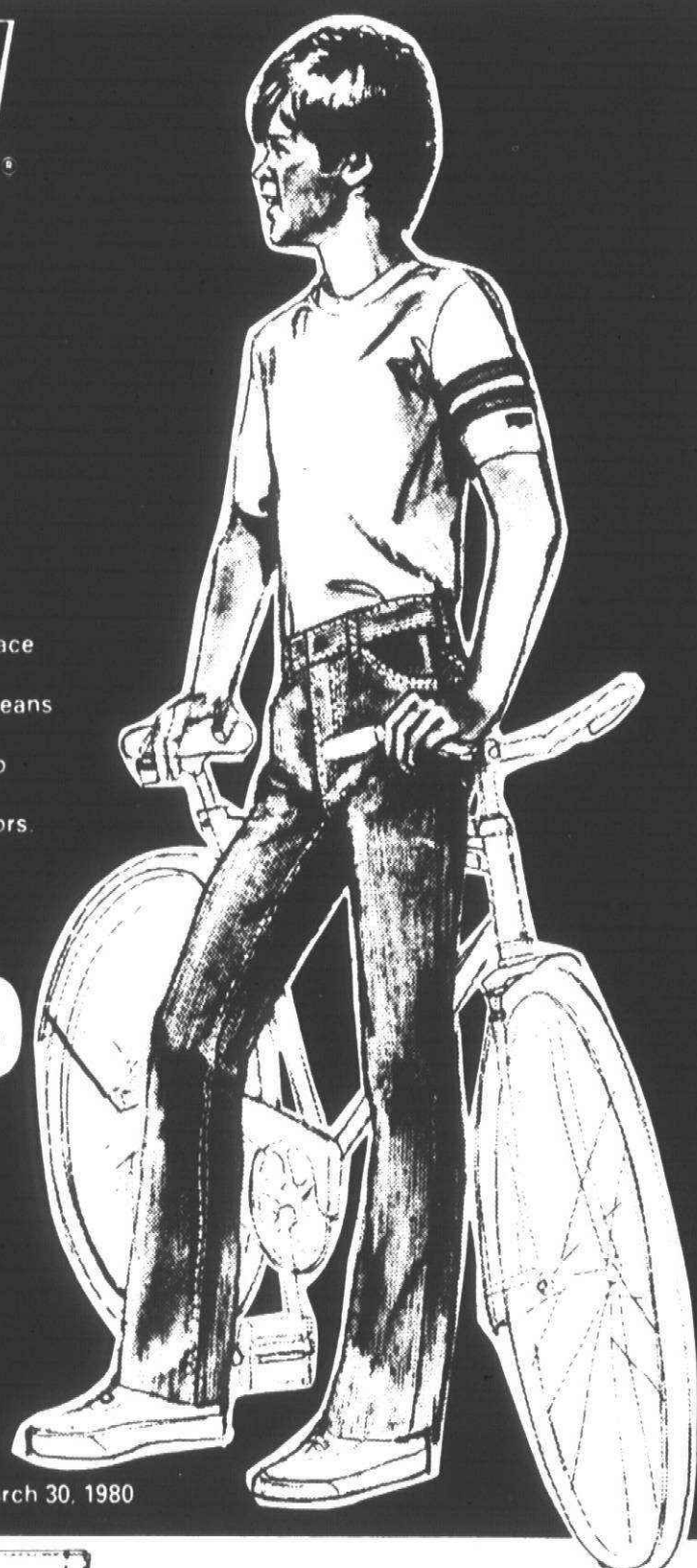

Saving lives is game plan of community CPR plan

Saving lives. That's what a new program initiated through the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools is all about.

The technique being promoted is cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). So far, about 1,400 ninth graders are in training and it's hoped that someday the measure will be taught to the entire community.

(Ninth graders are learning CPR through a required health class.)

That someday is approaching fast.

The community education department is rounding up a schedule for community training now.

Since the program began last year, some 30 community residents have been trained as instructors of CPR.

Equipment, now used in the school district, is available for this community program.

Donated by the Plymouth Rotary Club are six CPR mannequins (two of which are infant size) and two training films used in classroom instruction.

According to David Dursum, community education assistant director, the first step to training the community is to insure there are enough trained instructors.

"With only limited number of instructors, you wear them out."

To help, one of their goals is to train school administrators as well as its teaching staff. So far, three school administrators and two teachers in the district have received this training.

"We're hoping this mushrooms throughout the district and saturates the community."

Rotarian Lee Feldkamp, also an area physician, says this group's goal is to ensure "a large cadre" of residents are trained in CPR so that someone is always on hand to aid a heart attack victim.

"We felt as a service organization we could well undertake this program."

All-Area spike team saluted

Area volleyball teams proved again this season that they are among the strongest, most powerful in the state. Clarenceville, for example, advanced to the Class B state finals for the third year in a row and finished second to Saginaw Eisenhower. The Trojans also won another Metro West Conference championship.

Livonia Bentley advanced as far as a regional final in the Class A tournament and successfully defended its Suburban Eight League title.

Livonia Franklin, which last season shared the Northwest Suburban League championship with Garden City East,

won the title outright this year. Livonia Churchill claimed its third consecutive Western Six League championship.

Even area teams which didn't improve their win-loss record from last year usually had an outstanding player or two.

Area coaches met recently to select the all-Observer volleyball squads. Two teams of nine players were chosen.

FIRST TEAM

Noreen Kelley, Livonia Stevenson. Kelley, who captained the Spartans and

who was unanimous choice as Most Valuable Player on the team, earned all-tournament honors at both the Schoolcraft and Plymouth invitationals.

The 5-9 senior has a verticle jump of 20 inches.

Kelley also was named to the all-Inter-Lakes League team.

"Noreen is undoubtedly the best all-around athlete I have coached in 12 years," said Stevenson coach Lee Cagle. "She is, in my mind, the most outstanding hitter in the area this year."

Beth Almburg, Livonia Bentley. A senior hitter and co-captain of the Bulldogs, Almburg also was named to the all-tournament teams at Schoolcraft and Plymouth.

Almburg shared MVP honors this season at Bentley and was voted to the all-Suburban Eight League team.

"Beth stands out on the court because of her enthusiasm, hustle and the way she plays defense with reckless determination," said Bentley coach Dana Hardwidge. "Beth is a strong server and a steady passer."

Sue Kutko, Livonia Franklin. Kutko, a senior, won a place on the all-Northwest Suburban League team and the all-tournament honorary squad at Schoolcraft.

During the season, Kutko had 48 unreturnable spikes, 23 saves on defense and was good on 103 of 111 serves.

"Rarely do you find a player who can perform all the volleyball skills with excellence," said Franklin coach John Miltz. "Sue is such a player. She combines her fine skills with a great desire to improve herself."

Kim Plachta, Livonia Bentley. Plachta shared team MVP honors this season with Almburg. Plachta, a senior, was also chosen for the all-tournament team at Plymouth.

"Kim improved more in one year than any player I have ever coached at Bentley," said Hardwidge. "This year, she was a dominating force at the net with her spiking and blocking."

"Kim was Bentley's leading hitter this year, aching 52 percent of her spikes," Hardwidge added. "She was also a very strong, consistent server."

Barb Beebe, Redford Thurston. Beebe, a 5-9 senior hitter, co-captained the Eagles this season.

She was Thurston's most improved player last year (1978-79) and repeats this season as an all-Observer choice.

"Barb has been instrumental in many of our wins this year," said Thurston coach Jane Robey. "She has won varsity letters all three years at Thurston. She's a fine hitter and server."

Leigh Feenstra, Livonia Churchill. The 5-10 senior has played on three league championship teams during her varsity career at Churchill. Feenstra was particularly effective at the net blocking and spiking.

She also co-captained the team this season to a 15-1 record.

"Leigh is a consistent server and plays aggressive defense," said Churchill coach Mike Hughes. "She plays smart offense knowing where and when to tip."

"Leigh has the capacity to single-handedly change the momentum of a match by putting the ball straight down (spiking), even against a good block," Hughes added.

Jody Humphries, Westland John Glenn. Humphries, a senior, was named to the first all-area and all-Northwest Suburban League teams this year after earning second-team laurels in both last season.

The 5-7 hitter was Glenn's top point scorer and its best defensive passer. Humphries also proved to be a good blocker.

Sheila Julien, Clarenceville. Although only 5-2, Julien packed much power in her hits. The junior was par-

ticularly adept on defense, both blocking slams and going for digs.

Julien, Clarenceville's Most Improved Player during the 1978-79 season, has been to the state finals throughout her entire varsity career.

"Sheila's strong defense has played a major part in six tournament victories," said Tom Teeters, coach of the Trojans.

Robin Taylor, Redford Union. Taylor, a 5-10 senior, has been RU's Most Valuable Player both this season and last.

A spiker who also does well as a center-blocker, Taylor was voted to the all-Northwest Suburban League team for her performances this year.

"Robin is a hard hitter and server," said RU coach Jim Gibbons. "She's a good, all-around athlete who has been recruited for basketball, volleyball and track."

SECOND TEAM

Cheryl Sobkow, Plymouth Salem. Sobkow, a junior and three-year varsity performer, was voted the Rocks' Most Valuable Player this season and last.

She was also named to the all-Suburban Eight League squad this year.

"Cheryl played as the strongest hitter and blocker on the team," said Salem coach Cathy Himes. "She played as a leader and a competitor and dominated the game at the net."

Sherry Kiselica, Garden City East. A senior, Kiselica co-captained the Panthers during the recently completed campaign.

"Sherry is a tough server and did a very good job blocking," said East coach Sue Rich. "She is a smart player and has a good attitude."

Cindy Bussart, Livonia Churchill. A spiker, Bussart, a two-year varsity performer, was the toughest server on the team this season.

The 5-10 senior served six or more points in seven matches.

"Cindy is an excellent hitter, consistently spiking with velocity," said Churchill coach Mike Hughes. "Cindy plays aggressively defensively and does not have a volleyball weakness."

"Linda has been our most enthusiastic booster for three years," said coach Lee Cagle. "She has been extremely consistent all year as our number one setter and server."

Jean Rowley, Redford Thurston. Rowley, a 5-9 hitter, co-captained the team this season.

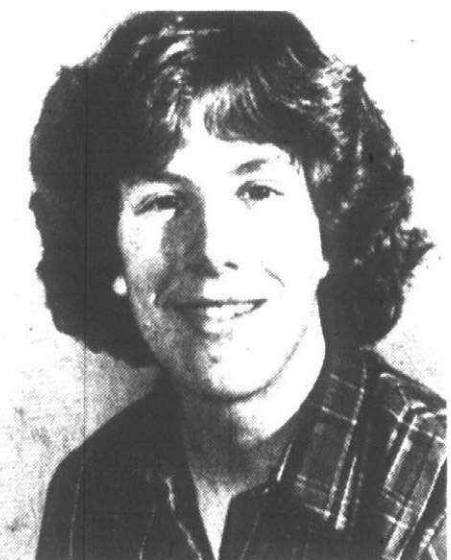
"Jean is the most improved volleyball player I've ever coached," said Jane Robey. "She is a hustler, great blocker and never quits, whatever the score."

The senior played with the varsity throughout her four-year high-school career.

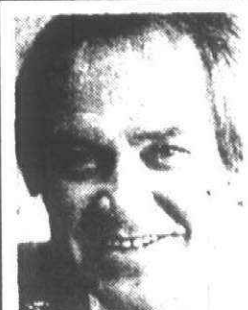
Jamieson this season was named to the all-Catholic AA Division team.

New track coach seeks improvement from Chiefs

Richardson optimistic about chances

With seven of the top 10 point producers from last years team returning, the Plymouth Canton girls' track team looks to be much improved over its fifth place finish of a year ago.

First year coach Bob Richardson is optimistic about his team's upcoming season, but isn't sure if it has the depth to be a strong contender for the Western Six League title.

"We're very young," said Richardson, "and I'm not sure just how much depth we have."

"Distance and middle-distance are definitely our strong events but I don't know about our sprinters yet. We'll get our share of first places but we'll need depth to win the dual meets. It's the seconds and thirds that win meets."

Of the nine returning letter winners from last years team, Michelle Perrot will head the list. Only a sophomore, Perrot was last year's top point producer as a freshman. She is a long distance specialist (one and two mile) who Richardson will try to work in a few relays.

Senior Geri Shufeldt, another long distance runner, will be the second part of the Chiefs' one-two-three punch in the one and two mile events along with Perrot and junior Kathy Brophy. All three girls qualified for state competition last fall for the Canton cross country team.

"We have strong senior leadership,"

said Richardson. "Our season depends on how fast our girls come along in our unknown events. We're not sure what we have in our field and sprint events because I was sick for the last three weeks and we haven't had time trials yet."

"But if our distance runners come through, as we expect they will, and we pick up some points in the field and sprint events, we should do pretty good."

During Richardson's illness, the girls practiced with the boys' track team, coached by Mike Spitz.

"I think Mike did a great job in helping out," said Richardson.

Liz Gorecki, a senior with fine leadership qualities, will help the Chiefs in the much needed field events. She will throw the shot put and discus. Diane Durocher, also a senior, will help out in the field events.

One question mark for Richardson is senior Jill Pedersen who broke her leg during a basketball season and still is unable to run the hurdles, which are her strong event.

"JILL STILL feels some pain when she steps down hard, so we'll have to wait and see if she can help us in the field events," said Richardson. "Right now we have her throwing the shot put and the discus."

Senior Mary Fideler will high jump and run the hurdles for the Chiefs while Charlette Thomas, a sophomore, competes in the sprints. Sophomore Lori

Shufeldt will sprint and run some relays along with throwing the discus.

"We're working very hard for success," said Richardson. "I think we will improve on last year's 2-7 dual meet record and fifth place league meet finish."

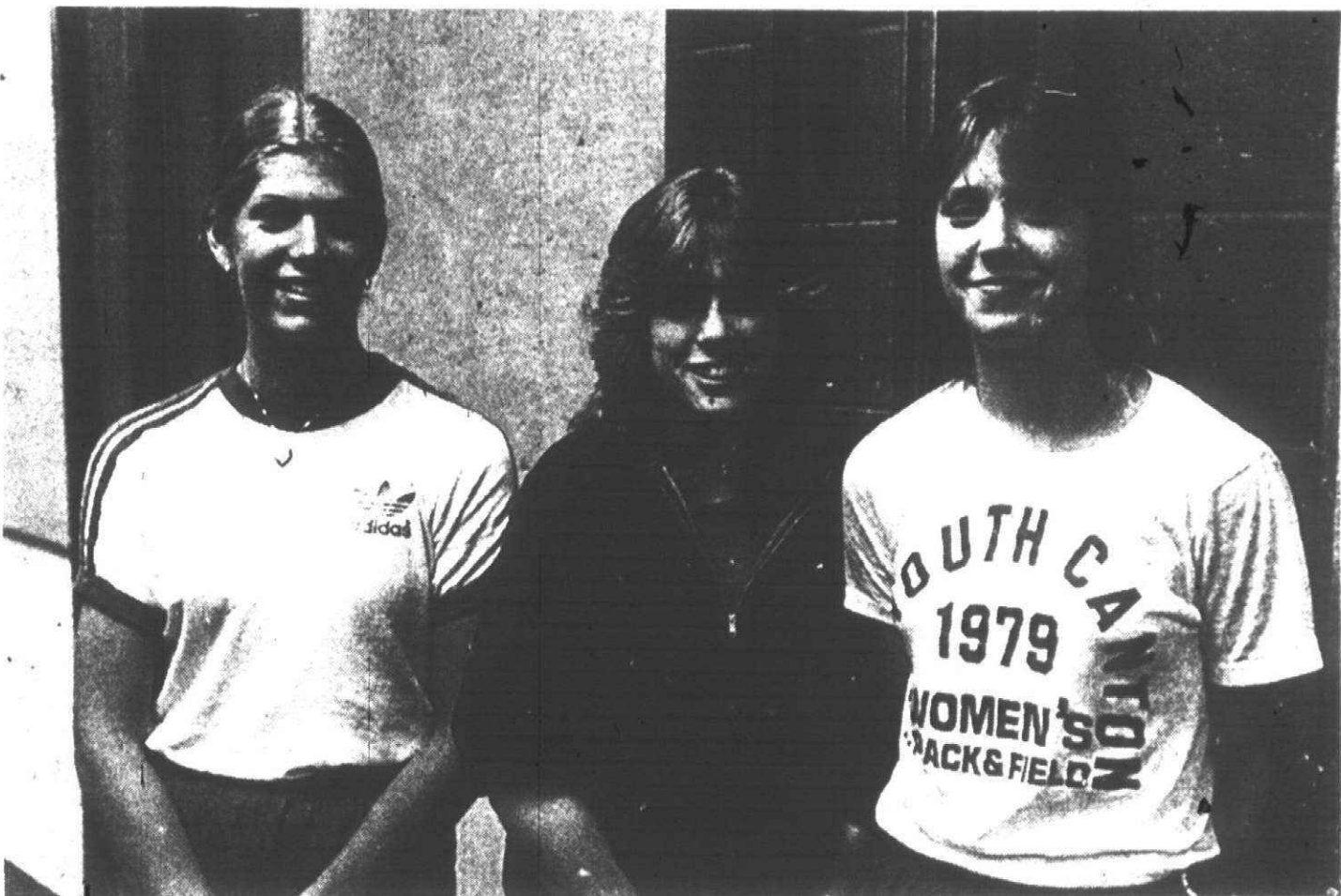
"We're experimenting right now, moving girls around, trying them in different events."

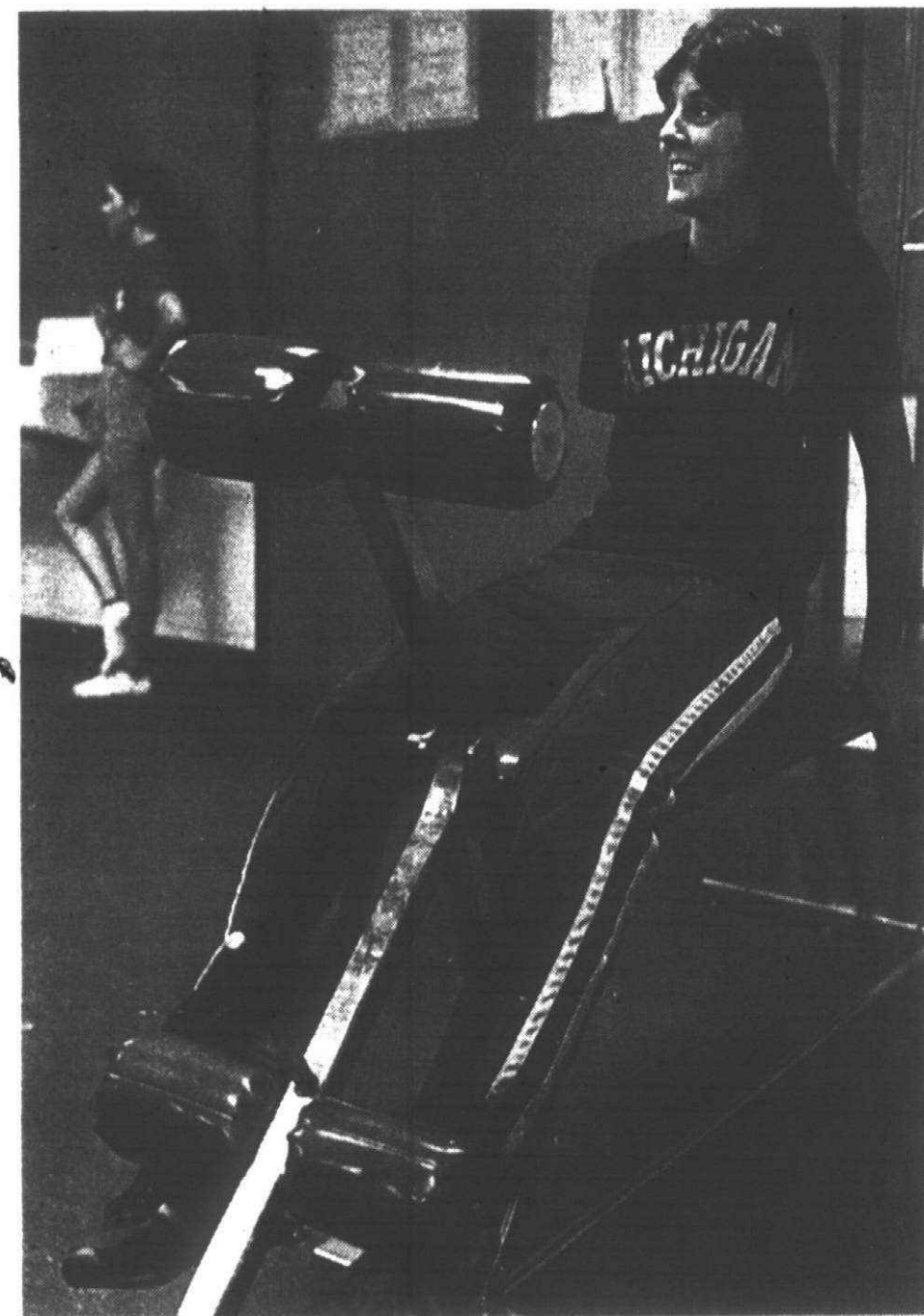

Judging by the attendance figures at the national championships being sponsored by the Pro Bowlers Association at Sunnybrook Lanes in Sterling Heights this week, the Detroit area will play a major part in all future schedules and the area can be assured of at least one outstanding event each year.

Golden Eagles loop, Wolf Nickerson was high with 634.

AT WOODLAND LANES Bill Wilson had one of his better nights as he registered a 688 on games of 234, 223 and 231. Art McCullough was next with 649.

Much of the spotlight was focused on Larry Gautier in the Kings and Queens loop, when he rolled nine strikes in a row and then settled for a 265.

In the youth league, Mike Strak, 12, with a 134 average posted a 214. Ray Chamberlain, with a 162 average, paced the Gay 90's with a 616 and Gordie Staff had 214 in 575.

In the men's junior house league at Super Bowl, Bob Cole landed on top with a 255 in 670 and June Eckles had a 256 in the Strike and Spare loop.

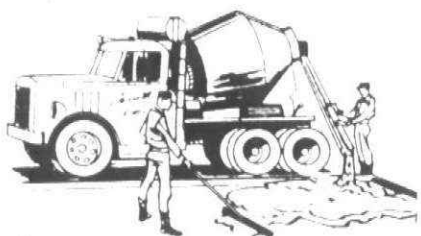

Ford house: A journey into the gracious past

When Mrs. Edsel Ford wrote her will, she requested that upon her death she would like the home she and her husband built in 1926-27 preserved, maintained and used.

This wise lady indicated that because of our changing society and high taxes, dwellings of this sort might never again be built. A foundation was established to comply with her wishes, and on March 18, about 90 Plymouth women became the beneficiaries of this foresighted plan.

Toni King and Jan Gatoni of the Plymouth Community Arts Council made arrangements for this large group to visit and have lunch in the gracious Edsel & Eleanor Ford House on Lakeshore Drive in Grosse Pointe Shores. One bus and several autos transported the party across town and into another time and world.

The estate is approached through the gate house and down a long road from which one can see the pool and pool

house, the power house, and the play house given to Josephine Ford by her grandmother, Clara Ford.

Upon entering the Cotswold-style home, which was designed for the Fords by world famous architect Albert Kahn, one senses immediately the dignity and warmth of Eleanor Ford.

Jane Horner, Mary Jean Gross, Eleanor Warren and Elaine Kirchgatter were among those greeted by executive director Paul D. Alandt and Donna Oliver, his assistant.

PARASOLS & Galoshes

GUESTS WERE encouraged to roam about the first floor and enjoy the surroundings in which Benson, Henry II, Josephine and William Clay Ford spent their childhoods.

All the furnishings and accessories are those the Ford family chose and lived with from the time they moved in until Mrs. Ford's death in 1977.

The only exception is the superb art collection which was donated to the Detroit Institute of Arts, and is now faithfully reproduced right down to the frames. The staff of 27 (22 members of which were employed by Mrs. Ford) keep the house and 88 acres of grounds in mint condition.

A favorite room seemed to be the paneled library, made even more inviting by the glowing fire in the fireplace. Liz Meault, Lynn Cozle and Mary Ann Trommell marveled at the Cezanne on the wall and looked at the books which ranged from Ilka Chase to history and travel to the classics. As the piano began to play softly, the artistry of Mercedes Kimling added to the feeling that this was an affair to which everyone had been invited and that Mrs. Ford herself might approach at any moment to make them feel welcome.

KATHY and JUDY Shankie, Dolly Zaibek and Chris Courtney registered surprise when they unexpectedly entered the art deco room which served

as a family fun spot with its sleek 1920s look. This cozy room seems even more appealing because of the delightful contrast to the more formal feeling in the rest of the house.

Another favorite for Terise Gall, Barb Crum and Kathy Wagner was Edsel Ford's study. The room is filled with personal mementos and photographs of family and friends. Admiral Richard Byrd and President Herbert Hoover share wall space with the Ford children and the ancestors. Edsel's desk stands near the fireplace, which has not been lit since his death.

Shortly after arrival, maids began to circulate with delectable hors d'oeuvres, which Mable Partain, Hazel Rogers and Mary Kehoe nibbled as they made their way from the morning room into the adjoining dining room. When the family was in residence, the dining room was never lit with anything other than the fireplace and candles.

CHRIS HAZLEY, Margaret Bake and Judy Morgan were almost reluctant to leave the parlor with its stunning crystal chandeliers when luncheon was announced. Tables had been set up in the large reception hall on a lower level, and salad, rolls and dessert were followed by a short talk by Alandt.

After a question and answer period, Pat Rood, Janet Repp, Joan Englehart, Ruth Clemens and Delores Fields made

their way to the sunlit terrace. Here they could see the lagoon and the 1 1/2-mile shoreline that borders the estate before heading west once again.

There is no doubt that Doris Chatterly, Jan Carney, Mary Kenny and Rosemary Houseman will happily join us as we tilt the parasol to the Ford family, who over the generations has added color and enrichment to life in and around the Motor City.

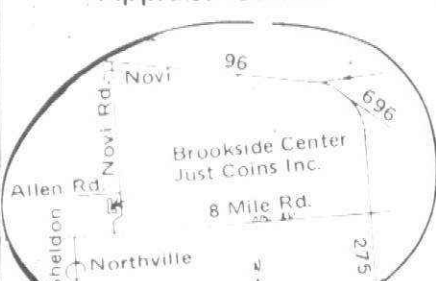

Lynne Tobin plays cello in Savannah

A former Plymouth resident, Lynne Tobin, was featured in a recent concert given by the Savannah Symphony Orchestra in the Savannah Civic Center theater.

Miss Tobin, who is co-principal cel-

list with the Savannah Symphony, was featured with concertmaster Nurhan Arman, Robert Stephenson and Michael Olesak in Haydn's Sinfonia Concertante. The work features four orchestra musicians in solo parts.

Miss Tobin attended Plymouth public schools for eight years, and was awarded the Russell Isbister Award by the Plymouth Symphony Society in 1966. It was on the advice of former conductor Wayne Dunlap that she decided to concentrate on the cello instead of the French horn.

The Isbister award enabled her to attend the National Music Camp at Interlochen for the first time. She returned there in 1970 as a student of the Arts Academy, and graduated in 1971.

Miss Tobin earned a bachelor's degree with distinction in music performance from the University of Michigan, and a master's degree from Illinois University, where she studied with the famous Russian cellist, Raya Garbousova. The latter was one of the first women in the world to have a successful career as an instrumental soloist.

In 1977, Miss Tobin married a fellow musician, Mark Street. He plays bass

viola in the Savannah Symphony, and is a native of Savannah.

The couple is living in a restored house built in the 1790s. Both enjoy the historic attractions of Savannah.

Miss Tobin previously held the post of principal cellist with the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra, Little Rock Chamber Orchestra, Northeast Arkansas Symphony, Illinois Chamber Orchestra and Northern Illinois University Symphony.

She was co-principal cellist with the WNIU-FM Baroque Orchestra, and made many appearances with U-M orchestral organizations.

She received the Norrey S. O'Conno Award for Outstanding Musical Achievement presented by Maurice Abravanel of the Music Academy of the West, as well as several other awards and music scholarships.

Her parents are Mr. and Mrs. Richard K. Tobin, formerly of Plymouth, now of LaGrange, Ill.

New pastor eyes growth

Stepping into a new and carefully-chosen ministry, the Rev. Jim LeDuc has plans to make his presence felt in a church that has accomplished that task in its community.

LeDuc is taking over at Kirk of Our Savior, 36660 Cherry Hill, Westland, after seven years as assistant minister of the First Presbyterian Church of Mt. Clemens.

And he sees in his new role the need to be a leader in growth for his congregation.

"Growth is a big issue," he said shortly after welcoming 20 new members into Kirk of Our Savior. "That's a good number, but it must be continued if this church is to have the impact it can have in this area."

"This congregation, numbering about 275, has been challenged to bring one new member each during the coming year. That's a reasonable goal, considering all the contacts with unchurched people we all have."

LeDuc said he feels it's an especially possible goal for the congregation in which he now is working.

"I did a lot of considering before I made a change," he said, "and I am sure I have chosen well. This is an excellent church, and its quality of leadership has been superlative. In the first three months that I have been here, anything they've said they would do has been done. A minister can't ask more than that."

LEDUC FEELS Kirk of Our Savior has "made its presence felt" in many ways although not a particularly large congregation.

One is through hosting a Wayne County nutrition program for senior citizens five days a week for the last three years.

"We're really proud of that work," he said, noting that about 40 elders come for lunch and fellowship each weekday.

Another involvement has been the backing of member Doug Bissland in his role as board member for the Youth

Living Centers, a new residential facility for homeless youth in Westland.

"And our former pastor, Loren Schribner, ran for city council with the full support of the congregation," LeDuc added.

Coming into his new role in Westland, this clergyman is setting for himself three short-term goals along with a few others of longer range.

"First," he said, "I hope to strengthen our Sunday morning worship by trying some new things. Maybe a liturgical dance group or a clown ministry."

"I'm not insensitive to our heritage, but I would like to see us be very creative in finding new ways to interpret the age-old message."

LeDuc also wants to work more with community ministries, to focus on some of the large problems of the day.

"We need to have more understanding of matters like retardation, for example," he said. "People out there are looking for a forum to bring important messages, and the church could provide one."

His goal for revitalizing worship also includes making the church in some way a center for sacred art.

"That has been a great historic function of the church," he satated, "and now as public money sources dry up, it should be ready to assume it again."

"Art is the mirror of our culture, and if we lose it we have nothing."

ADULT EDUCATION and youth work are the other focal points in LeDuc's short-term goals.

"It is so important for adults to keep learning that it seems to me the church today is going to succeed or fail on the basis of its adult education," he said.

He has in mind a summer series of mini-courses for starters. "These would give members a chance to teach what they know and bring together people of like interests."

Youth ministry, LeDuc said, is something "we've got to look at in a different way."

"Young people must have a place in church life. They can't keep on just getting together to play and socialize."

'Whale of a Story' told at Allen

Ask a group of fifth graders to write a play about the growth of democracy and they come up with "A Whale of a Story."

Students in Carol Welsh's class at Al-

len Elementary School had been studying democracy in their social studies course. The suggestion that they reenact democracy's growth through the years resulted in weeks of research and work.

First they outlined the important steps along the way. Then the class was divided into groups with the assignment to come up with a story dealing with a given phase. These were put together in chronological order before the script was written.

The children decided to use a Grandma Whale and a Baby Whale to tie it all together. Grandma would tell the baby all about democracy. And to make it more interesting for the younger students who would see the play, they used the writers' privilege to improvise. They would have whale ancestors playing a major role in the process.

GRANDMOTHER WHALE began her story with Socrates in ancient Greece. She went on to Cicero and Horatio and the Roman laws.

She told about King John refusing to sign the Magna Carta though urged by his knights. In their version, King John would have taken off and left the charter unsigned if it hadn't been for Magna the Whale who pushed him back on shore. The noblemen were so grateful that they named the charter after him.

As the Pilgrims sailed across the Atlantic to find justice in the New World, their ship sprang a leak. A whale, named Plymouth, stuck his nose in the hole in the Mayflower until they were safely on shore. The Pilgrims were so grateful, they named their landfall Plymouth.

So it went. When Ben Franklin sent Paul Revere out to give the warning that the British were coming, Revere's horse collapsed and a trusty whale carried him along to the background music of the old Lone Ranger program.

They went through the Civil War and World War II. Roosevelt fell out of his wheel chair and was rescued by Won-

der Whale after a meeting with Churchill, MacArthur and Eisenhower.

BABY WHALE asked if there always had to be wars for democracy and grandmother said, "No, there was one man..." and she talks about President John F. Kennedy as a chorus sings "Camelot."

The play ends with the arrival of a spaceship, after a countdown. As it lands in the water, the door jams and the astronaut has to be rescued by Spacy the Whale.

It wasn't all fun and games. During the play, the students recited the preamble to the Declaration of Independence, the Gettysburg Address and they danced a ballet around the Statue of Liberty as "Give me your tired, your poor. Your huddled masses yearning to be free. The wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tossed to me, I lift the lamp beside the golden door!" was recited.

The boys performed a space dance and formed a pyramid each carrying a lighted flashlight covered with colored cellophane paper. The finale planned by the young writers was a touching scene: A dead President Kennedy lying on catafalque (under a spotlight) as the whole cast joined in the singing of "One Little Candle" each holding a lighted candle.

"The mothers were very supportive," said Mrs. Welsh. "They sewed costumes and helped make the whale body parts. The children made the scenery and parts of the costumes in art class."

The play was performed twice Tuesday for parents and other classes in the school. As the mothers dried their eyes after the play, they admitted it was a very touching performance - a whale of a story.

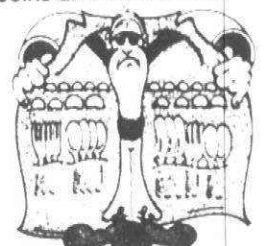

There will be Chippendale, Hepplewhite, Queen Anne and primitive furniture.

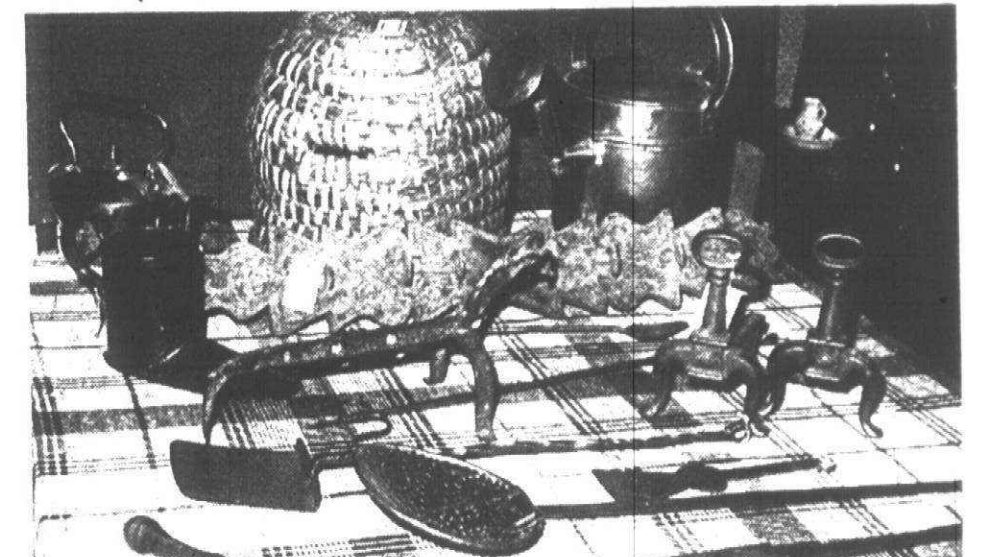

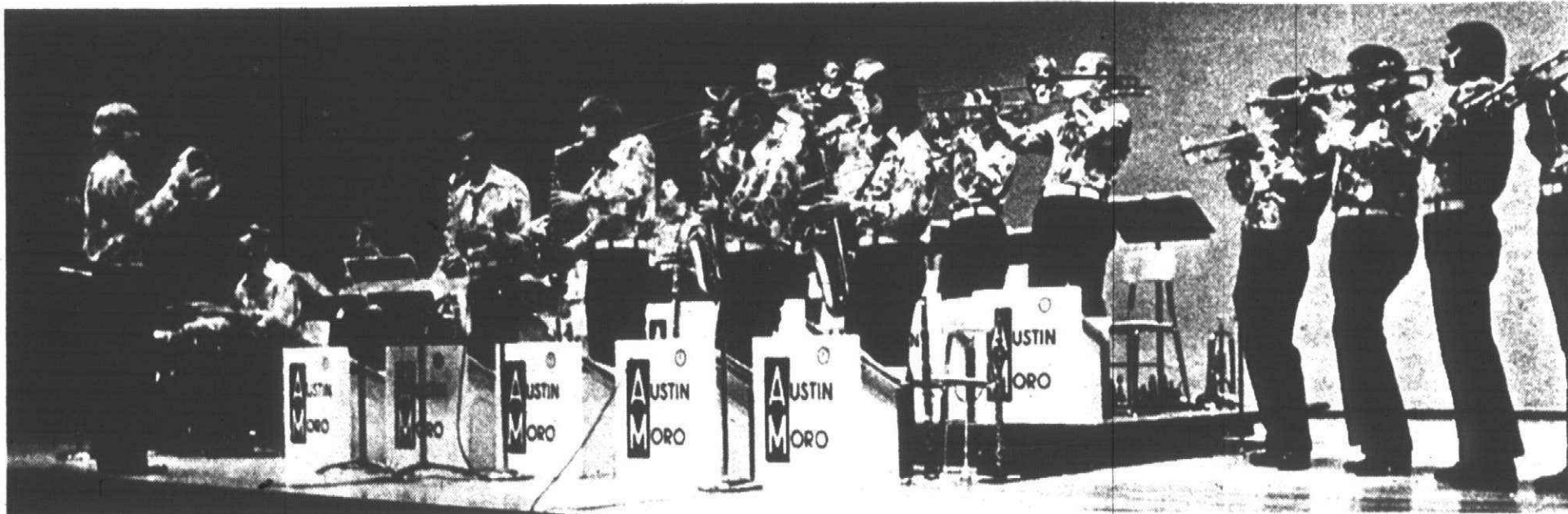

'Sound of Music' still scores hit for Easter Seals

When "Sound of Music" came out as a motion picture about 15 years ago, movie columnists told of "junkies" who returned to see it many times.

Local "Sound of Music" fans will have a chance to see the production live and help raise money for handicapped children at the same time.

That opportunity is given them through a drama student from Livonia's Churchill High School who kept up her stage activities while working as a real estate company receptionist.

The production directed by Lisa Danke, 20, will have its last of seven shows at 7:30 p.m. Friday in Plymouth West Middle School, on Ann Arbor Trail at Sheldon, west of downtown Plymouth.

The shows not only give local actors and singers a chance to display their talents before an audience but also raise money for the Wayne County Easter Seal Society. The non-profit group has a number of year-round programs for the physically handicapped.

Ms. Danke and her stage crew started the Easter Seal fund-raising last spring with a colorful production of "Return to Oz," a jazz version of the 1939 movie "Wizard of Oz."

"SOUND OF MUSIC" has many favorite popular songs, including "Do, Re, Mi," "My Favorite Things" and "Climb Every Mountain."

The production this spring is sponsored by Century 21 of Michigan, Ms. Danke's employer.

She acted and sang in six productions while attending Churchill.

Besides directing the current production, Ms. Danke will sing and dance in the role of Liesl, oldest daughter of the Van Trapp family, and a nun.

It was her idea last year to put on the "Return to Oz" and "Sound of Music" this year.

No auditions were held. "I asked friends and people who had a theater background," she said.

Several were from last year's "Oz" show. Another is Carol Pringlemeir, a Plymouth woman who worked for suburban real estate firms before her current position with Century 21.

Mrs. Pringlemeir was in high school and college shows, including "Our

Town," "Peter Pan," and "Gentleman Prefer Blondes."

In "Sound of Music," she plays the role of baroness Elsa Shraeder, who is engaged to Van Trapp before Maria comes on the scene.

IN THE LEAD role of Maria is Lisa Wurster, a Southfield-Lathrup High School senior. She has been in the Southfield Summer Music Theater productions of "Oklahoma!" "Showboat" and "Carousel," and in the school production of "Once Upon a Mattress."

Besides her singing and acting background, Ms. Wurster has been worked in technical roles for many theater productions.

Don Andres, 21, of Livonia, plays the male lead of Van Trapp, the stern widower, and is involved backstage as the production's coordinator.

Andres was active in Churchill High School's productions of "L'il Abner" and "Italian Straw Hat" and played the Tin Mah in last year's "Return to Oz."

Making his stage debut is Chris McCrory, a singer in the Livonia Bentley High School concert choir and Bentley Singers, an ensemble. He will play Max Rolf, who arranges for the Van Trapp family to "go public" in their native Austria.

Kevin DeBoer, 21, of Livonia, plays Rolf, the boyfriend of the oldest Van Trapp daughter. A student at Schoolcraft College, he was graduated from Livonia Stevenson High School. He is making his first appearance in a musical.

DeBoer previously sang in church and school choirs.

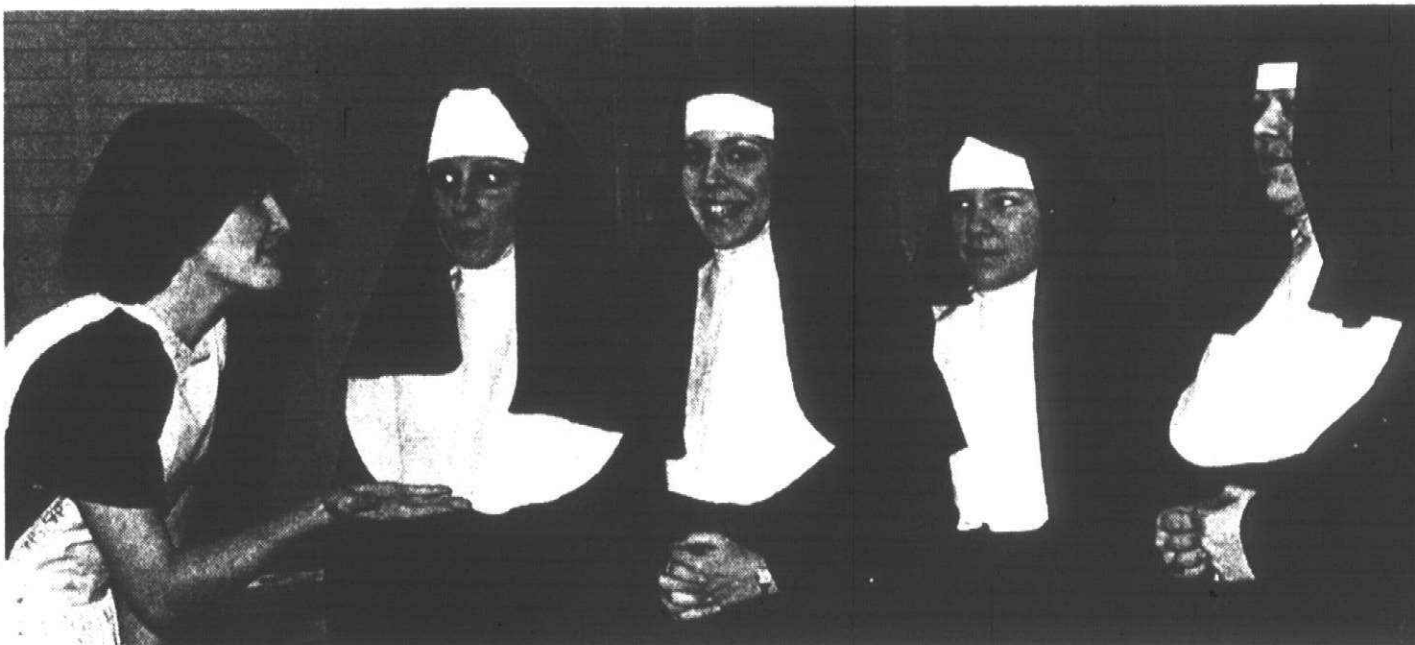

Mixing the instruments

If you think about it, Solisti Barocchi & Friends, the group which plays baroque chamber music monthly in Southfield, has a built-in problem with its instruments.

On one hand, Bach, Pepusch, Handel and that crowd wrote for instruments different from those we know today — recorder, valveless horn, short-bowed viols, harpsichord.

On the other hand, modern instruments are stronger, more resonant, more flexible.

So when you're performing two hours of baroque music, do you play antiques? Do you stick to modern instruments? Or do you mix them?

MISCHA RACHLEVSKY, director of this ensemble of Detroit Symphony professionals, chose to mix them during last Sunday's concert in St. David Episcopal Church in Southfield. He had his reasons.

"Many baroque instruments are hard to play. Some couldn't sustain a note. Some were hard to keep in tune," he said prior to the concert. Rachlevsky mingles freely before, during and after concerts, as if he were hosting a get-together of old friends in his home.

Another reason is that many baroque composers — Bach stands out — wrote for "voices" rather than idiomatically for particular instruments. Thus, in many works, instruments are freely substitutable. You can use modern instruments to play this old music.

But when you mix instruments, players using the modern instruments must restrain themselves, Rachlevsky said — and that can be a trick.

HE POINTED to the J.C. Pepusch's Sonata for Recorder, Violin and Cello, third number on the program.

"The recorder sounds louder in the slow movements than in the fast movements. So I can play up in the slow movements, but I have to hold back in the fast ones," the young violinist said.

That takes conscious effort on his part. At heart, the Moscow-born Rachlevsky has a warm, buttery style that reminds one of Francescatti and Stern.

Douglas Cornelsen, a clarinetist with the Detroit and West Bloomfield symphonies, did the recorder honors.

With Rachlevsky restraining himself on the fast movements and with Debra Fayroian providing firm underpinning on cello, old and new instruments did indeed blend.

Miss Fayroian's role most of the eve-

ning was confined to underlining bass note. Only in the Trio-Sonata for Violin, Horn and Continuo by J.J. Quantz did she have a chance to show what this highly flexible instrument can do.

WORKS BY J. Rameau and W.F. Bach further proved that the baroque period was more than J.S. Bach and Handel. In fact, it was a pleasant surprise to hear a concert of works that are rarely recorded but which are still easy listening for the non-professional ear.

Those works also tapped the talents of Faith Foster, soprano; David Wilson, harpsichord; and Eugene Wade, French horn.

Wade used a modern horn with valves, there being no point in using the old valveless horn.

Wilson and his harpsichord were a great favorite with the audience. The high, wooden ceiling of St. David's, at 16200 W. Twelve Mile, provides marvelous acoustics for such a gentle instrument. I had heard it in the excellent Novi High auditorium but could hear it far better in St. David's.

St. David's, unfortunately, presents a different kind of problem for Solisti Barocchi & Friends. As Rachlevsky put it, "I can't break the mentality that if it's in a church, it's put on by the church."



'Nightcap with Mozart'

Violist Hart Hollman (above) and cellist David Soltzman will be among the performers in this Friday's 11 p.m. "Nightcap with Mozart" in Birmingham Unitarian Church, 651 Woodward north of Lone Pine Road in Bloomfield Hills.

Ford pottery is 'hands-on' exhibit

Henry Ford Museum's special exhibit, "Panorama of Pottery," which runs from March 29 through April 13, could be subtitled, "A program with visitor participation offering everything you always wanted to know about pottery but didn't know whom to ask."

The program will be offered 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. weekdays and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekends and Good Friday.

The exhibit will begin with a potter making reproductions from the Henry Ford Museum collections in Dearborn. There will also be live demonstrations of decorating redware and craftsmen showing methods of slush casting, drape molding and examples of waxing, glazing and decorating a candlestick.

"Panorama of Pottery" provides a hands-on experience for visitors. Six potter's wheels, using kick-power, are available with clay samples for visitors to try their hands at making a small bowl — or whatever else it develops into.

Another hands-on segment will allow visitors to work with the various methods of decorating pottery, including stippling, slip trail and sgraffito.

There is no additional charge for "Panorama of Pottery," beyond regular museum admission of \$4.25 for adults, \$2.25 for children 6-12 or the special senior citizen rate of \$3.50. Children under six are admitted free.

Southfield's Pavilion: best suburban facility?

Some reflections on the new Southfield Pavilion, at which the initial concert will be played at 8 p.m. Friday by the Detroit Concert Band:

This could be the biggest (2,000 seats) and best auditorium outside Ford and Orchestra Hall in Detroit and Hill in Ann Arbor. Schoolcraft College lost its change for suburban leadership when voters repeatedly rejected a fine arts center with a 2,500-seat auditorium.

Consider: The bigger high school auditoriums are in the category of 900 to 1,000 seats, with Our Lady of Mercy at 1,200. The big-time auditoriums are in the 3,000 to 4,000 seat class.

ACOUSTICALLY, Southfield's may be imperfect at first. But as Oakway Symphony Conductor Francesco DiBlasi put it, "It's a helluva facility."

The key ingredient, DiBlasi said, is the high ceiling in the pavilion at 26000 Evergreen. You can't have a great auditorium without one.

"It was still boomy when we

rehearsed," DiBlasi said. "But they didn't have all the acoustical carpeting in yet, and it will be different when you get people in there."

There are other variables, he added. Whether a performing group uses risers will make a difference. He doesn't care for high risers.

The acoustical shell behind and around the group will make a difference. And there are doors that can be closed off.

Marlowe Belanger, who is promoting the place for the city of Southfield, says it will be used for different kinds of concerts, lectures, performances and so on.

DiBlasi said there may be a difference in how a chamber group, a concert band, 52-piece concert band and a full symphony orchestra sound.

In any event, he's eager to play it.

HELEN ROWE, publicist for the Detroit Concert Band, snorts at Detroit critics who accuse Dr. Leonard B. Smith's outfit of playing in "military" uniforms.

"Doctors (in a hospital) have uni-

forms, and those aren't military. Nurses have uniforms, and they aren't military. Waitresses have uniforms. Policemen have uniforms. A symphony orchestra has uniforms — tuxedos — and that isn't military," she said.

So the smarties who say the DCB plays in military uniforms literally don't know what they're talking about, Miss Rowe said.

PEOPLE IDENTIFY Smith with Sousa marches. But this will be no Fourth of July concert.

There will be works of Sousa and Goldman on the program, to be sure. But then there are such works as excerpts from Wagner's "Lohengrin," Johann Strauss' "Die Fledermaus" and Chabrier's "Espana" that are usually played by a symphony orchestra.

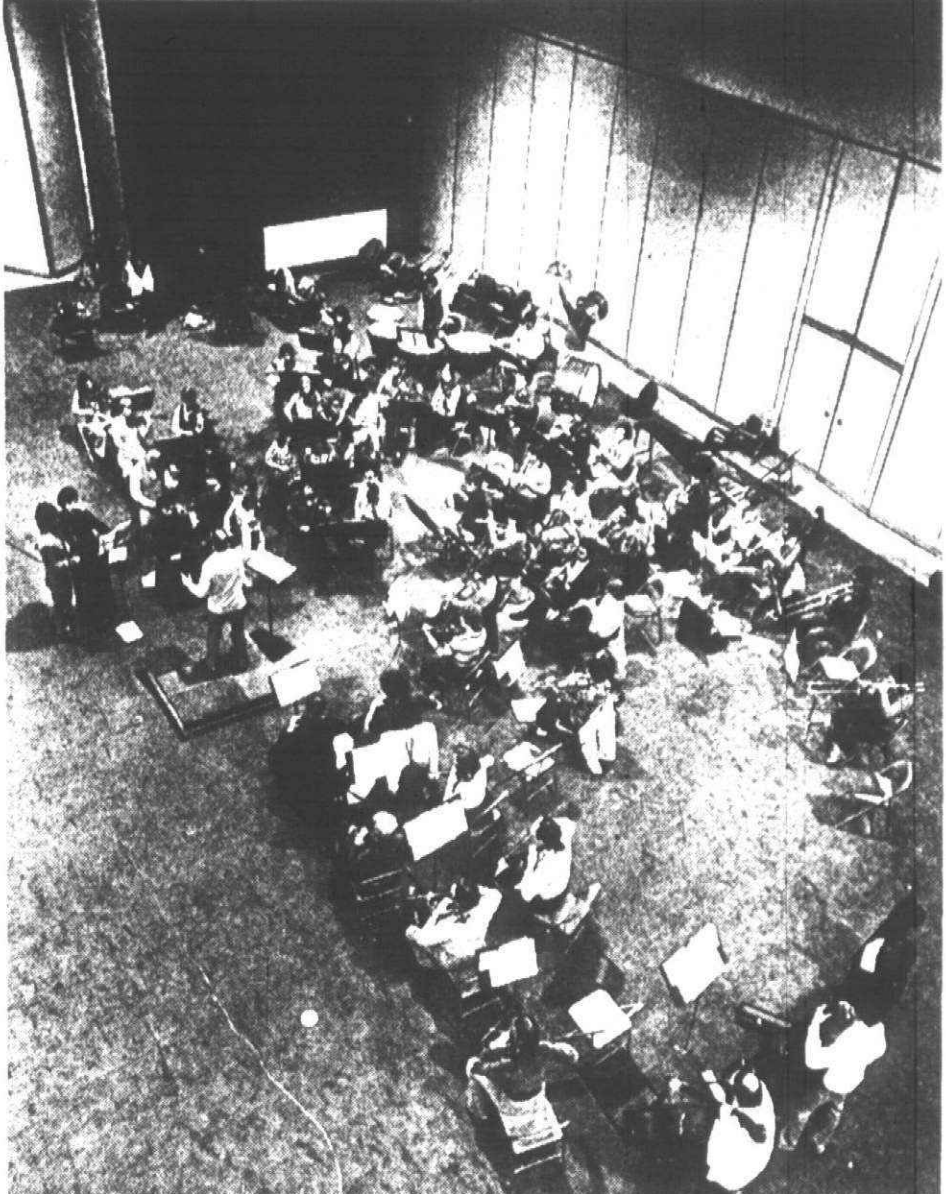

BEARING IN

Before you may begin bear off (the process by which you begin removing checkers from the game), all of your checkers must be in your home field.

Bearing in safely (bringing your remaining checkers from the outer board into the home board) is important only if your opponent has captured one or more of your home board points or has an additional checker on the bar.

Bearing in safely or properly may avoid an embarrassing situation later — e.g., leaving an exposed blot.

In the diagrammed position, black owns white's one point and has a checker on the bar. Also, long before this, white had doubled the cube and black accepted.

Black is anticipating an eventual chance to hit white. White rolls a five-four in this position. How would you play the five-four roll?

Obviously, there are several differ-

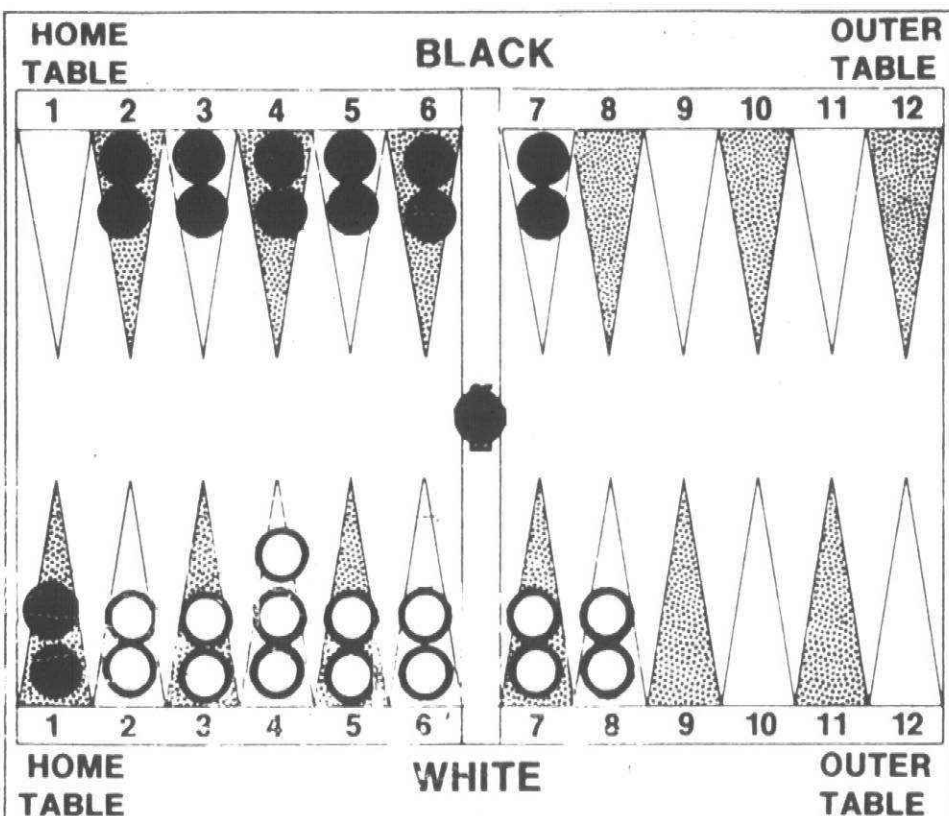
ent plays that bring in two checkers safely. For instance, white may move his checker in from the 8 point to the 4 and 3 points. Although this move is fine, the key consideration in this position would be to clear the bar point (or 7 point) by moving both checkers from the 7 point to the 2 and 3 points. Why?

Should black get off the bar on his next roll, and if white does not clear the 7 point now while he has the opportunity, white may roll six-five, five-six, six-four, four-six, six-three or three-six (six chances out of 36), which will leave him an exposed blot on the 7 point.

Also, by clearing the 7 point, double sixes play well. With both checkers on the 7 point, you have no possible way of moving sixes.

Remember, bearing in safely while your opposition holds a point in your home board is for your protection.





Fishing, hunting licenses start 40% rise

AND WITH opening day for trout just a month away, you'll no doubt be pleased to learn that the boys in Lansing are on the verge of jacking up license fees for fishing and hunting.

The proposal is a staged, two-year hike that by 1981 would increase resident fishing license fees, for example, by 40 percent, from \$5 to \$7. Similar big percentage increases are proposed for other licenses.

For residents, small game licenses would also increase 40 percent, from \$5 to \$7 in 1981, and deer licenses would increase 26 percent, from \$7.50 to \$9.50.

Non-residents would face stiffer in-

creases, like a 40 percent boost from \$25 to \$35 for small game, an 87 percent increase for firearm deer licenses, from \$40 to \$75, and a 50 percent fishing license fee increase from \$10 to \$15.

Eliminated under the proposal would be resident muzzleloader deer licenses, beaver and otter trapping, military hunting and the camp deer permit. Most of these licenses are incorporated elsewhere in the new fee structure.

Senior citizen fees would also be increased, from 50 cents to \$1 for fishing licenses and a new all-game hunting and trapping license for \$4.

My friend C.O. Jones files a complaint about these increases. "This brings my annual fish cost to \$26 a pound," said Jones, who counts it a good year when his annual bass is 13 inches instead of 12.

The fee increases would add \$3 million to the state Game and Fish Fund

this year and maybe \$6 million more next year.

The bill that would bring the increases has been passed by the state House and is under consideration in the Senate.

FLY FISHING is a lot of fun and at times the most productive method of taking fish. But it's got an image problem. People think it's hard.

It's really not, once you've learned the basics, which for \$25 you can do thanks to the Canton Township Parks and Recreation Department. They'll run a nine-week class starting at 7 p.m. Monday in the old township meeting hall, at Cherry Hill and Canton Center.

Fee is \$25, and materials are extra. Call 397-1000 for information and registration.

AND SPEAKING of sailing — we were, weren't we? — there'll be a 90-minute film titled "Rhapsody in Sail" shown at Ford Auditorium at 8:30 p.m. Friday. Narrated in person by John Biddle, the movie will be shown by American Youth Hostels.

The film includes footage of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club Etchelle-22 Class race, the biannual Block Island Race held off Rhode Island, rescue footage of last year's disastrous Fast-net Yacht Race on the Irish Sea, and sailing in San Francisco Bay.

Wallpapers give rooms personality

Wallcovering can and does arouse more controversy than any other element in interior decoration. The reasons are understandable.

Paper isn't cheap, and neither is its designing, production and distribution. Rising costs and an increasingly style-conscious public have both forced and permitted wallpaper to enter a new phase.

No longer can it be dismissed as a substitute or makeshift. Everyone now recognizes that wallpaper, although it falls in many categories, is a decorative form in its own right.

No one needs to apologize for it. On several price levels, it expresses every possible degree of sophistication.

Controversy continues about the way wallpaper is used. There is seldom any question about its appropriateness in any area. Its ability, through pattern, color, texture, to echo every known style, in real or simulated materials, make it indispensable as a purveyor of atmosphere.

Well and good, where opinions differ is in the use. There are no safe formulas regarding and controlling color and scale. Rarely can one say "Do this," and Don't do that."

As more people put patterns on their walls and actually see how they look, the old rules are being amended, if not, quite often reversed. We are rapidly becoming conditioned to bolder patterns and stronger color.

THE ALL-PURPOSE play-it-safe wallcoverings have value in many situations, but they are more apt to be practical than esthetically stimulating.

Have you noticed a sudden distinction between "wallpaper" and "wallcoverings?" All wallpapers are wallcoverings, but not all wallcoverings are made of paper.

The main difference isn't in the cost of the materials. Wall papers can be just as expensive as the most luxurious coverings for the wall printed on imported silk, while wallcoverings, of a tough material like vinyl, may differ in cost according to whether they are produced by machine, automatic silk-screen, or entirely hand-printed silk screen.

The difference to the eye is negligible. How a pattern is produced depends, of course, on whether it is styled to reach a large market or a limited one.

It is rather reckless to generalize, what with popular taste changing so rapidly, but for the time being one might say that wallcovering as a whole conjures up a more conservative and durable product. Wallpaper, with the possible exception of the mass market, suggests a more decorator-oriented approach to design.

DECORATIVE OPPORTUNITIES offered by wallpaper and wallcoverings combined are almost infinite. There is often an agonizing choice due to the vast variety of selection. Diversity of pattern is the very essence of wallpaper and wallcovering and high adventure for those who can handle the choices. There are no hard and fast rules.

There is joy in making the right choice. Naturally there will be hesitation, consultation — even panic. No one can know precisely, in advance, the total effect of any patterned area. The more positive the pattern, the greater the gamble, but also, in decorative terms, the chance of greater pay-off.

Patterned wallpaper can do nearly anything to our walls except make them go away. The rigidity and relative permanence of walls is, in fact, the principal reason for putting patterns on them — to modify their starkness and give them a special and acceptable character. You create an entirely new environment with wallpaper.

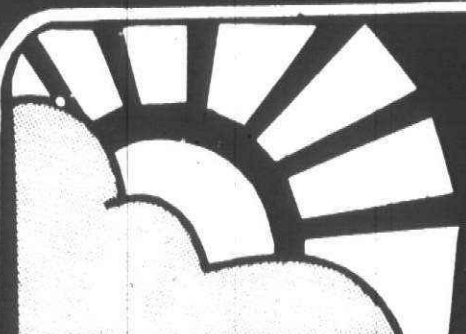
