Board moves to save money by less travel

In a move reflecting members' fears of a shattered economy, Canton's Board of Trustees voted Tuesday to require its approval of any employee's request to attend conferences or seminars costing more than \$100 or held more than 100 miles away.

But even before a resolution was passed to require its scrutiny, the board turned down a bevy of requests involving instruction or conferences.

Board members admitted the decision would not save a huge amount of money, but felt every little bit would help if the economy continues to plummet.

The entire board approved the resolution, made by Trustee Stephen Larson, but not without some members debating its necessity.

SUPERVISOR NOEL Culbert said, "If we have to scrutinize every request, we'll never get anything done," in response to Trustee Robert Greenstein's initial move to have all requests go before the board.

Clerk John Flodin said he believed the opportunity to attend seminars and conferences has never been abused. "I think the staff realizes the thrust of the board. In all the years I've been here, there's never been a great amount of money spent on trips."

Flodin said he thought the current policy of requiring board approval of trips of more than 100 miles was adequate.

Greenstein, however, said any money that could be saved should be used for development of an emergency preparedness plan in case economic disaster strikes.

"It seems to me you're re-allocating by eloquence how the board wishes to spend money," Culbert responded.

"This could be a case of being penny-wise and pound-foolish."

CONCERN OVER the economy extended to most matters discussed by the board Tuesday.

Job status needs Donahue's input Deputy awaits treasurer's actions

Deputy Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz got numerous pats on the back Tuesday night, but a full-time job is yet to be arranged — at least for another week.

Members of the Canton Township Board of Trustees agreed that Ms. Falkiewicz had done an outstanding part-time job in her \$135 per week appointed position.

They also agreed that more help was desperately needed in the treasurer's office. But the motion to pay Ms. Falkiewicz \$18,000 per year plus fringes

providing she work full time failed because Treasurer James Donahue was not present at the meeting.

Trustees said they wanted to hear Donahue's intentions regarding his own duties and those of the deputy treasurer before they would vote on the salary. The issue was tabled until next Tuesday's board meeting.

DONAHUE has announced that he probably will resign his part-time elected post due to health problems.

When he was elected in 1978, he appointed Ms. Falkiewicz to serve as his deputy treasurer. Only the treasurer has the authority to set the deputy treasurer's hours, the board sets the salary.

Trustee Robert Greenstein, said he has spoken to Donahue and that the treasurer would indeed authorize Ms. Falkiewicz to work full time, but most board members wanted to hear the statement in person.

Donahue could not be reached for comment Wednesday morning.

Greenstein, who introduced the motion to increase Ms. Falkiewicz's salary, said Donahue had also told him he was considering an attempt to remain as treasurer by only attending board meetings and leaving the administrative duties to the deputy treasurer. Donahue reportedly also said he would

return his remaining treasurer's salary (except for the \$75 per meeting pay) to the township.

TRUSTEE Stephen Larson cautioned that something had to be done for Ms. Falkiewicz or the township "could be left with nobody" in the treasurer's office.

"I don't see how we can expect Maria to put in the kinds of hours she has been paying for," Larson said. "I'm not sold on this (voting the salary increase without actual control of the hours) but it seems our only option."

Greenstein said the board could always chance the salary if Ms. Falkiewicz did not end up working full time, but added that the deputy treasurer had worked full time on her part-time pay much of the year.

"This would only be a temporary

measure until Nov. 20, at which time we would have a full-time treasurer (the board voted to make the office full time after the next election)," Greenstein said. "Then we'll have to decide."

BOARD MEMBERS said they realized Ms. Falkiewicz needed an answer about employment as soon as possible.

But they also expressed confusion about what Donahue would do for the remainder of his term.

If Donahue resigns, Clerk John Flodin said, there is a strong possibility that the board would appoint Ms. Falkiewicz as acting treasurer. In that event, she could only serve on a part-time basis, since the office is currently at that level. Greenstein said Ms. Falkiewicz, if made acting treasurer, would receive only about \$3,000 remaining of the \$7,500 treasurer's salary.

"The worst that could happen is that Mr. Donahue would regain enough of his health to be able to continue his administrative duties, in which case we would have the help we need in the treasurer's department," he said.

Special Olympics needs volunteers

Plans are well under way for the 1980 Wayne County Special Olympics, which will be staged this year at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP) and at Super Bowl Lanes.

The Plymouth Civitans will host the 1980 Special Olympics here for some 2,800 participants from throughout Wayne County.

The bowling events will be staged in Super Bowl on Ford Road in Canton on Saturday, April 26. Gymnastic events will be the same day at the Plymouth Canton High Phase III facilities at the CEP, while swimming, track and field events will be Friday, May 2, at the CEP.

To make sure the event is a success, the Civitans are in need of about 600 volunteers to act as huggers, score keepers, timers, life guards and judges.

"What we really need is some adult huggers," explains Mike Caffery of the Plymouth Civitans. "Some of the students from Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools have volunteered as huggers, but we also need some adults who'd be willing to spend just a couple hours giving participants a hug and encouragement in other ways."

Most athletic teams and coaches already have committed themselves as volunteers, Caffery adds.

THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS is held each year to give handicapped youngsters a chance to demonstrate their skills at bowling, swimming, and track and field events.

Winners at the county olympics will advance to the Michigan Special Olympics held each year in Mount Pleasant.

In Wayne County the site of the olympics is rotated once a year among Wayne-Westland, Livonia, South Redford and Plymouth-Canton school districts with Civitans in each area serving as hosts.

For April 26 the Civitans need at least 50 volunteers for the gymnastics competition and about 65 for the bowling competition. Gymnastic events will run from 8:15 a.m. to 1 p.m. and bowling from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

For swimming, a minimum of 20 volunteers are needed and for track and field at least 170 volunteers are needed. Swimming will be from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and track and field events from 8:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

The above needs for volunteers do not include the need for adult huggers.

Track and field events will include: softball throw; girls' track; boys' track; high jump; long jump; frisbee tosses, for distance and for accuracy; pentathlon; the wheelchair event; and a special event for blind runners.

Plymouth's manager is 'disappointed' in Canton's district court decision

Plymouth City Manager Henry Graper Jr. is disappointed that Canton Township is planning to form an independent district court.

Graper said Monday that a separate Canton court would be economically unwise because it would create an additional tax burden on Canton residents.

Graper, the city's representative to the district court site selection committee, was reacting to last week's vote by the Canton Board of Trustees to break off from the 35th District and form its own district court.

The 35th District includes the city of Plymouth, Plymouth Township, city of Northville, Canton and Northville townships.

GRAPER SAID he believes many of the people in the district did not realize that the court is paying its own way and is not being subsidized by general tax revenues.

The court could operate more economically if it were located in a single building, added Graper, estimating the annual savings in operation costs would be more than \$100,000 a year.

The savings would return more revenues to the five municipalities and could be used by them to offset the cost of rising inflation and help them avoid having to levy added taxes.

As it presently stands, Graper said, the district court is distributing hundreds of thousands of dollars each year back to the five communities. A single building for the court would mean even larger savings to the taxing units and residents of the 35th District, he added.

Graper noted that the city was ready to sell the bonds when the court requested added space and suggested a single courthouse for the district. The bond sale was delayed so the city wouldn't end up paying additional taxpayer dollars for debt retirement for an expansion project which might not have to be done at all, depending on what the court decided.

The state approved the bond sale in 1978 to finance the expansion and the city wants to sell those bonds within the next 30 days.

The expansion would add more space for the police, fire, building and finance departments and include an elevator to comply with the state barrier-free design law.

The 35th District Court now occupies a large amount of space on the second floor of City Hall and a decision to locate elsewhere will alter the expansion plans.

Graper noted that the city was ready to sell the bonds when the court requested added space and suggested a single courthouse for the district. The bond sale was delayed so the city wouldn't end up paying additional taxpayer dollars for debt retirement for an expansion project which might not have to be done at all, depending on what the court decided.

If the court moves out of City Hall, added Graper, its space would then be used by other city departments and the expansion project would be much smaller in scope.

Graper also is awaiting word from Plymouth Township on whether the city's bid will be accepted for offering police services. If the city provides police services to the township some of the bond money then would be used to expand police facilities.

GRAPER SAID THE only reason the city became involved in helping build

and finance the new court structure is to save the court money.

By saving money with a single courthouse the court then can repay the cost of bonding, design and construction to the city and return more money to the five governmental units "which, in fact, would mean that in all five it would be the people who would benefit."

"The city of Plymouth was only helping each of the other four to benefit more, as well as itself."

"The only way for the district court to operate economically is for the two judges to be in the same building operating out of courtrooms."

"When the judges have to travel to two or three different locations to hold court, there is a duplication of services

and an extensive cost to the operation of the district court system."

"The city of Plymouth, as well as three of the other four, still will be working towards trying to come up with a solution to a unified district court under one roof."

"By doing so we will be able to pass along savings to the taxpayers and have revenues to help operate our townships and cities so as to keep from having to raise taxes."

The court presently holds sessions in the cities of Plymouth and Northville, and in Canton. Judge James Garber has been holding court sessions in Canton with Judge Dunbar Davis dividing his time between Northville and Plymouth.

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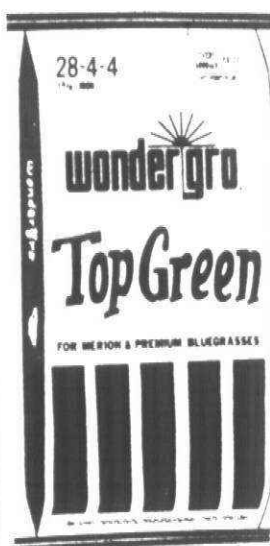
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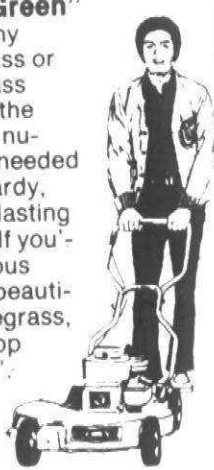
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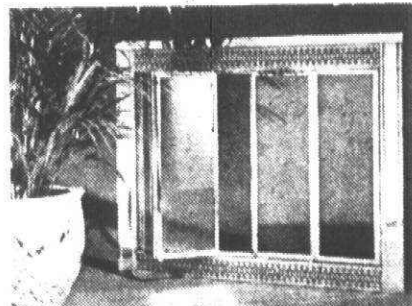
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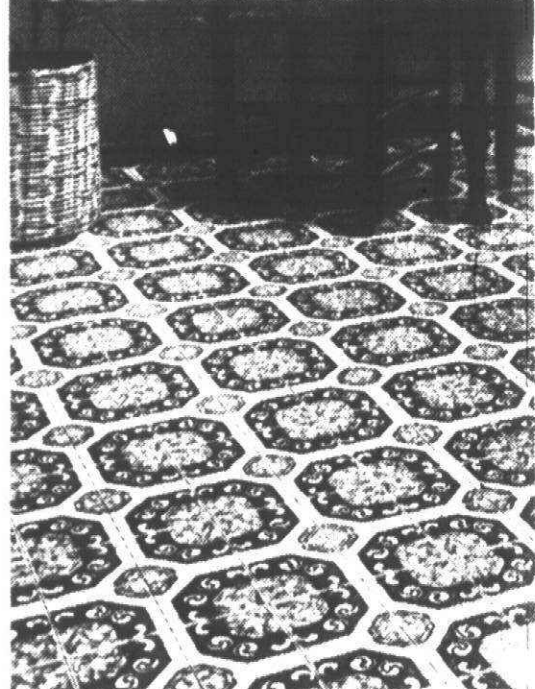
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'Ay, there's the rub'

Board proposes law as placebo for spa fears

Canton officials are trying to legislate away their nightmares that a newly-opened health spa will bring vestiges of Detroit's famed Eight Mile strip to the township.

But the spa owner insists that Canton residents can sleep easy.

Supervisor Noel Culbert admits that a proposed ordinance regulating massage establishments was prompted solely by the opening of Charlie's Executive Spa in the Harvard Square shopping center last January.

The business, owned by Mike Tremaine and Cheryl Corby under the

name Mich-Kim Limited, offers exercise equipment, saunas and massages to only men.

Culbert acknowledges that such businesses "can be a legitimate thing."

"I told the guy, 'If you're legitimate, you have no problem,'" the supervisor said. "But I also told him that we'd always be on the lookout for him. I told him that if he's doing anything illegal, we'll shut him down."

TREMAINE, who views his business as a place where men can come to relax, insists that the township board "has its wires crossed." He said Culbert has already "tried and convicted" him.

Tremaine said the ordinance proposed by the Canton Township board could shut down the massage portion of his business — a portion which he declined to tabulate.

"The health standards alone would close down every athletic club in Michigan," he said, citing one stipulation which requires a sink in every room.

The ordinance provides for the licensing of every massage establishment owner and technician following a police investigation into their background and moral character.

Tremaine said he doesn't mind "giving them my fingerprints and picture." But he vehemently opposes a police in-

vestigation of his masseuses on the grounds that their constitutional right to privacy would be invaded.

Culbert said Tremaine can meet provisions of the ordinance "if he really wants to give massages."

Tremaine said the ordinance proposed by the township board "is geared and pointed directly" at him.

Total Health Spa, a woman's exercise club on Ford Road, is the only other business establishment in Canton which offers massages.

Tremaine noted the concerns of Trustee Robert Greenstein at a recent board meeting that the ordinance proposal would affect that business as well

as Tremaine's.

"I support keeping the garbage out of Canton," Greenstein said at the meeting. "But I don't want to terrorize the good people by trying to get at the bad — if there are any."

TREMAINE SAID that less-than-wholesome activities take place at some massage establishments in the Detroit area. He showed pictorial advertisements of some massage parlors in an attempt to illustrate what his business is not.

"Any bar has more loose women than here," Tremaine insisted.

"I am not a massage parlor. I'm a health spa and massage facility. I'd like any doctor to stand up in court and say massages aren't healthy."

Tremaine used to operate The Oasis — a massage establishment in Center Line which he called one of the "clean" ones.

Lt. Joseph Dombrowski of the Center Line Police Department said his agency has never received any complaints about The Oasis. He said Tremaine never caused the department any problems.

Tremaine said his hiring policy at Charlie's prohibits the employment of anyone who admits arrest for loitering or solicitation. He said anyone who dates a customer is immediately dismissed.

"I don't want hookers working here. If she solicits a customer here and does it in her apartment, she might as well have done it here."

"I'm not into that," Tremaine said. "You go to jail, and it costs too much money."

Tremaine said he brought his business to Canton because of the absence of massage regulations.

Insisting that he and his business are "perfectly legitimate," Tremaine said he has invited Canton police to come into Charlie's unannounced.

"They don't even have to stop at the front desk," he said.

ACCORDING TO Tremaine, Charlie's was not intended originally as a men's-only club. He said he offered "free nights" and other promotions for women when the spa first opened in January.

"But not one broad showed up. So, in my own little way, I said, 'Good-bye ladies.'"

Tremaine employs 24 women between the ages of 18 and 42. They give massages, show men how to use the exercise equipment and play backgammon with customers in the lounge.

"These girls make fabulous money," he said. "Way better than the minimum wage."

Culbert said the township could "get real tough" on Tremaine and prohibit massages by the opposite sex.

The owner of Charlie's finds that idea disgusting.

"If I had men doing it, I'd have a bunch of gay cabelleros in here. I certainly wouldn't want a man touching my body."

Despite his opposition to the township's proposed ordinance, Tremaine favors some regulations on massage establishments, such as banning customers under 21. Tremaine said he questions the age of any customer who appears youthful.

No one under 21 is given a massage at Charlie's, although persons under 18 are admitted to the exercise rooms.

Tremaine said that his age policy for customers stands on shaky legal grounds. He added that younger men are usually the ones who come to massage establishments looking for sex.

"My customers are older, and they haven't given the girls any problems," said Tremaine, adding that one of his customers was 89.

TREMAINE SAID he would have taken Canton Township to court if the massage ordinance had passed in its original form.

The original wording prohibited the exposure of the "erogenous area" in a massage establishment. Trustee Greenstein, who has visited Charlie's to use the exercise equipment, convinced the township board to send the ordinance back to attorneys for revision. He said the language would prohibit people from taking showers.

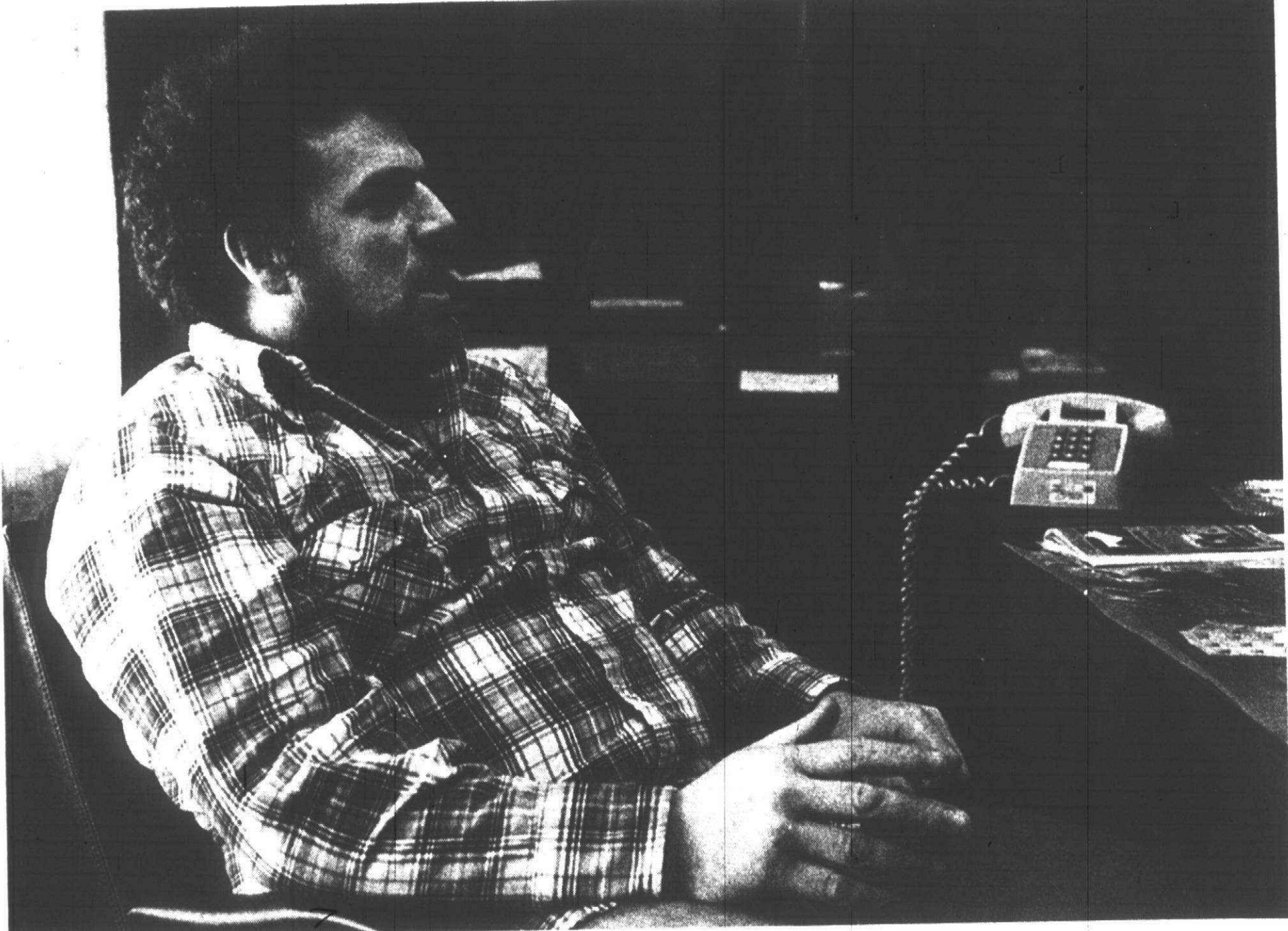
Tremaine views Charlie's as an alternative to health clubs for muscle-bound men. He insists that his business can be a "beautiful thing" for Canton.

"They can come here in to get away from their jobs and bureaucracy and not be laughed at. Everyone in here has a pot belly," said Tremaine, 36.

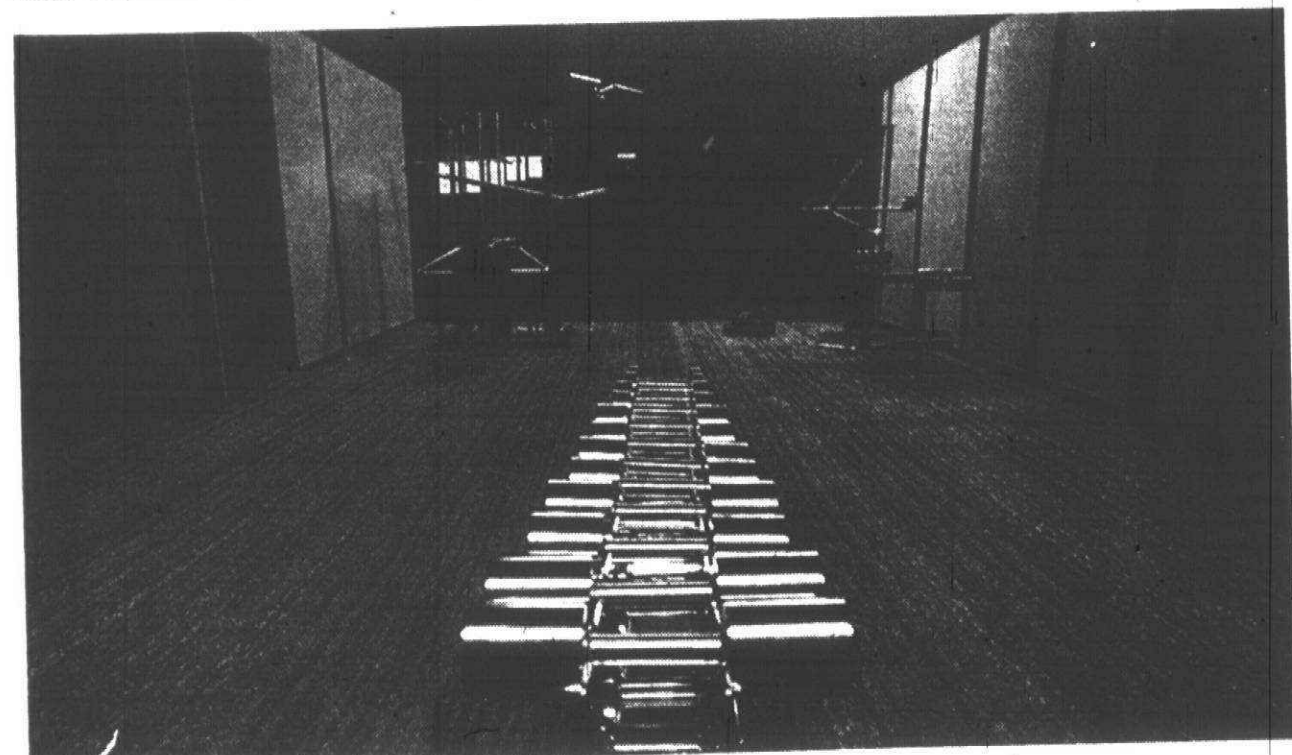
"People get tired of putting their elbows on a bar."

The massage ordinance proposal represents another attempt of the township board to legislate against the establishment of what it perceives to be a sexually-oriented business in Canton.

Included in the township's recently-approved zoning ordinance are stipulations which make it almost impossible for persons to establish adult bookstores or movie theaters, according to Culbert.

Benefit staged to assist rescue of animal shelter

A special benefit to come to the rescue of the Michigan Humane Society animal shelter in Westland will be staged in Plymouth on April 13.

The benefit to aid the Humane Society will run from noon to 6 p.m. at Napoleon's restaurant on Main Street in the city of Plymouth.

The bonanza will feature several celebrities, at least five bands, an auction of pets, sale of T-shirts, buttons and other fund-raising efforts.

The benefit is being planned by a group organized as the Save the Michigan Humane Society (SMHS) Committee.

This is the same group of people who have staged successful benefits in the past for such causes as the National Burn Institute in Ann Arbor.

BANDS LINED UP for the benefit include Tender Loving Care, Summit, Destiny, Roze, and Contraband.

Some of the celebrities who'll be on hand include Jim Harper, Jerry St. James, Jim Michaels, Jay Richards, Michael Bradley of WNIC and Fred Stella of WMJC. Also on hand will be Dexter Bussey, running back for the Detroit Lions.

Besides agreeing to appear the celebrities also have volunteered to allow pies to be thrown in their faces. Pies will be auctioned off to throw in the faces of celebrities or anyone else.

There will be an admission charge of \$3 per person at the door, or \$3 worth of cat food or dog food.

Drinks will be sold at reduced prices from noon to 6 p.m. with 25 cents from each drink sold going to the Michigan Humane Society.

During the benefit a slide-film presentation on the Westland shelter will be shown, including pictures of some of the individual animals at the shelter.

During the pet auction animals will be auctioned off to those wanting a pet. The bidding will start at \$45, which includes \$25 for the animal itself and \$20 for the spading/neutering fee deposit which is

returnable to purchaser upon proof that either has been done.

To adopt an animal purchased at the auction, the successful bidder will have to fill out a questionnaire at the benefit and then be interviewed by the Humane Society staff to make sure the individual can take care of an animal.

"We aren't auctioning off the animals just to get rid of them but to sell them to people who really want a pet," said Bear — that's his entire name — who heads up the SMHS. "If somebody wants to give just money, that's great. We don't want anybody bidding for a pet, though, as a way of donating if they really don't want one."

"The purchaser will be given a receipt at the benefit which can be taken to the Westland center to pick up the animal purchased."

THE MICHIGAN HUMANE Society needs to raise \$150,000 by April 15 to stay in business, Bear explained, because it has once-a-year expenses like insurance and taxes coming due at that time and must have the cash by then to continue operating.

If the \$150,000 is raised, Bear said, and some other donations received before December, then the Shelter expects it will be able to continue operating next year.

The shelter's expenses, beyond insurance, taxes and utilities, includes providing food and shots for animals, caring of animals, and investigating incidents of cruelty to animals.

Because of financial problems, the Humane Society already has had to lay off staff members and cut operating expenses.

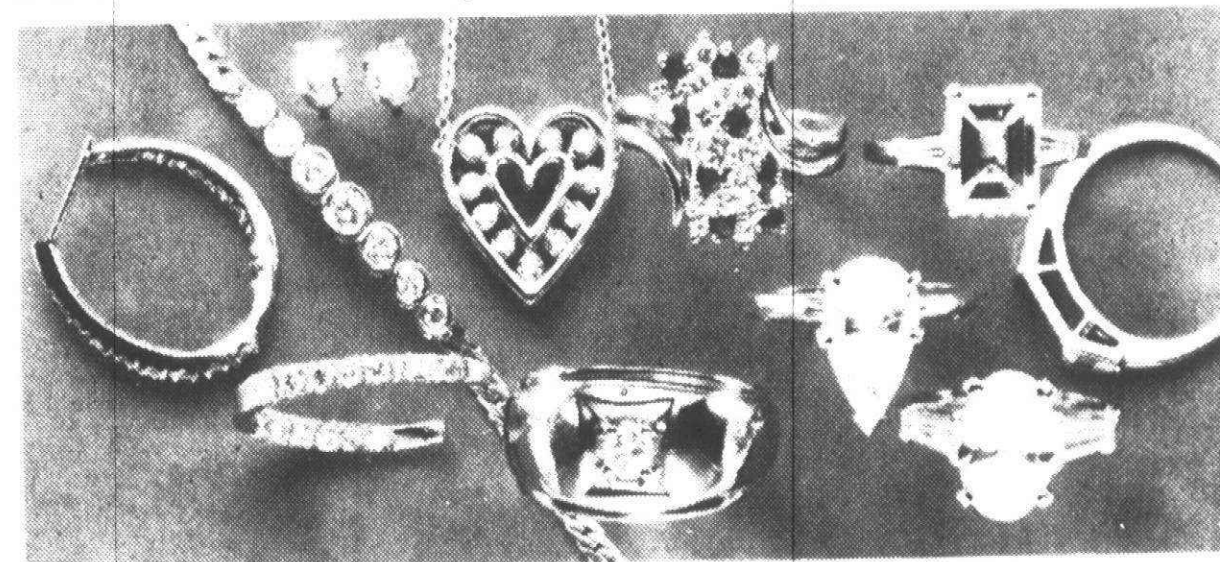
The society is a non-profit organization, added Bear, which doesn't receive any money from state and federal governments.

Three years ago, Bear added, the society had excess funds but have had operating deficits for two years in a row now and are struggling to balance its budget.

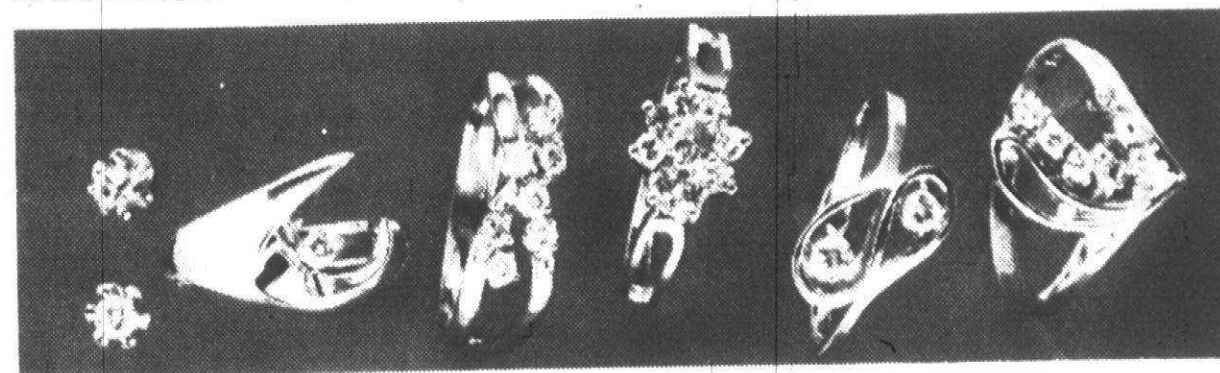

gie course to be offered to township staff members was termed worthwhile — but too expensive — by board members.
A request from ordinance officer Bruce Phillips to have members of his department attend free courses (geared to police officers but applicable to some ordinance work) was also refused

because of the hours officers would spend away from the job.
Phillips was given the option of allowing employees to attend the courses if they made up the time during the week.
And even Congressman William Ford's annual municipal officials' conference, which has often been attended by local officials in the past, was given

close scrutiny.
Board members decided that grants coordinator Terry Carroll might attend if there were any matters of interest on the agenda, but said they themselves would not go.
"This is all coming closer and closer to home," Trustee Carol Bodenmiller remarked of the belt-tightening decisions.

Women grads get less pay

If you're talking about earning power, women still aren't equal, according to a survey by Michigan State University's Placement Services.

That survey shows that women graduates earn about \$1,000 less at their first job than the average MSU graduate. Broken down by colleges within the university, the differences often are not as dramatic, because women still tend to take jobs in fields which traditionally pay less, says placement director Jack Shingleton.

Female students who graduated with bachelors' degrees between August

1978 and June 1979 earned an average of \$12,355. That's \$1,024 less than the average of all graduates with bachelors' degrees.

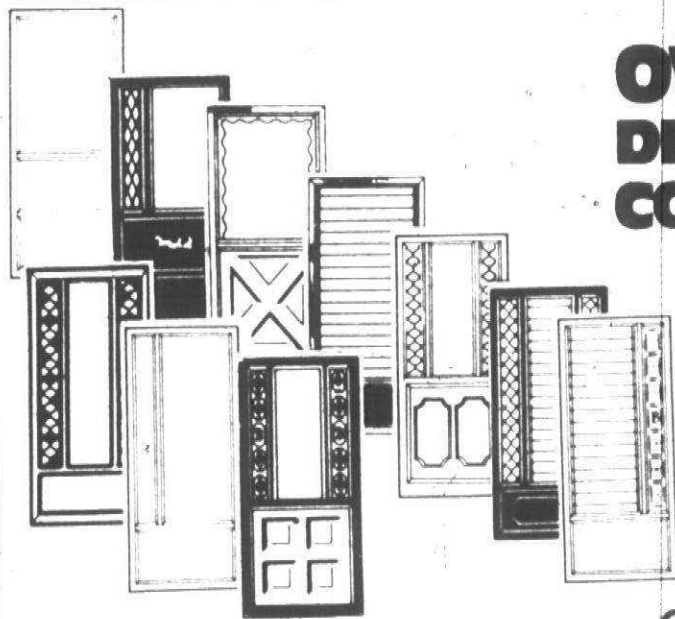
Shingleton says females also tend to be underemployed more than males, taking jobs as waitresses, receptionists and clerk typists when jobs aren't available in their own fields. Females also had a higher unemployment rate than the average.

About 7.6 percent of the female graduates said they were looking for work but couldn't find it. The average for all graduates was 6.1 percent.

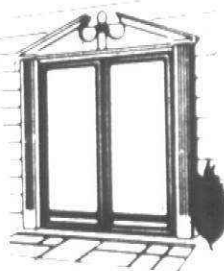
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What township businesses pay and receive

As in other communities, the question arises from time to time in Plymouth Township, "What do the commercial establishments get in return for their tax payments?"

Businesses pay property taxes to the school district and yet, of course, have no children in school.

Businesses in the township also do not receive any refuse collection for the taxes they pay but must contract with a private firm for garbage pickup, and that firm must be approved by the township.

HOW MUCH TAX do these commercial establishments pay, both on their real estate and personal property?

According to the 1979 figures, the latest available from Township Treasurer Joe West, the state equalized value of all commercial property was \$31,546,188. This consisted of about \$28.1 million for real estate and about \$3.4 million for personal property.

A township-only levy of 4.09 mills against the commercial tax base generates a tax revenue of \$154,576 for the township to spend.

What do business firms get in the way of services for the taxes paid?

According to information furnished by the township, businesses share in only five of the 12 services to residential taxpayers.

The services business and residential share include: Tax and election information and services; ambulance and rescue services; fire protection; police

protection; water and sewer maintenance.

Like residents, the only police protection now received by business owners is the road patrol on major roads by the county sheriff and on the freeways by the state police. The sheriff services are funded from tax millage charged by the county, and are not financed by

the 4.9 mills the township levies.

Included in the 4.9 mills levied against businesses and homeowners is one mill for police protection. But income from that one mill is not being spent yet for police services as the township hasn't yet decided with whom it will contract for police protection. And so that money now is in escrow.

THE SERVICES which homeowners are eligible for, but businesses aren't, include:

Golf course and park facilities; golf course and park maintenance; township ordinance control; control of township planning and development; enforcement of building codes and ordinances; liquor enforcement officer; and library

services.

Unlike the city of Plymouth where merchants must provide their own parking through the purchase of parking permits and/or credits, the parking areas around commercial buildings in the township is free and there are no parking meters.

The total tax base (SEV) of the township is almost \$244 million which produces a total income for the township to spend of almost \$1.2 million.

Thus, the commercial areas account for about 13 percent of the township's total tax base and total local tax income.

Skill Bank needs volunteers

A Skill Bank intended to help senior citizens in Plymouth cannot get started unless more retired skilled workers volunteer.

The Skill Bank is being organized under the auspices of the Plymouth Community Council on Aging, Inc.

The program is designed to offer minor home repairs and maintenance — such as painting, carpentry, plumbing, electrical work, lawn work and odd jobs — to retired seniors, age 60 and older, at reasonable rates.

The plan is to have the work performed by retired tradesmen and handymen who desire to earn some additional income while, at the same time, helping their fellowman.

Any skilled handyman can register with the council office, where a telephone communications center is maintained, by calling 455-4907 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

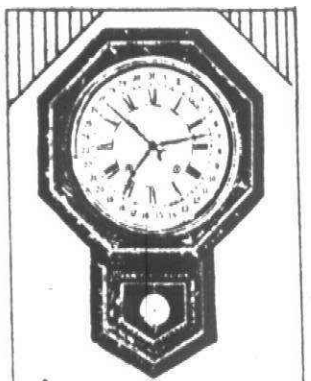
Retired homeowners who desire

work done may also call the center, at the same number and during the same times as listed above, to be put in touch with a job performer. The retired tradesman will then negotiate directly with the retired homeowner on the charges for the job.

This project, while new to Plymouth, has proven successful since its inception in October 1979, says Walter Fletcher, chairman of the Skill Bank program.

"Finding jobs is not a serious problem," says Fletcher, "but more handymen and tradesmen are needed. Anyone wishing to offer services should call the council office."

The Plymouth Community Council on Aging, Inc. is an independent non-profit organization of volunteers who are advocates for needed services for the elderly. The council is funded by local benefactors and does not receive any state, local or federal funds.



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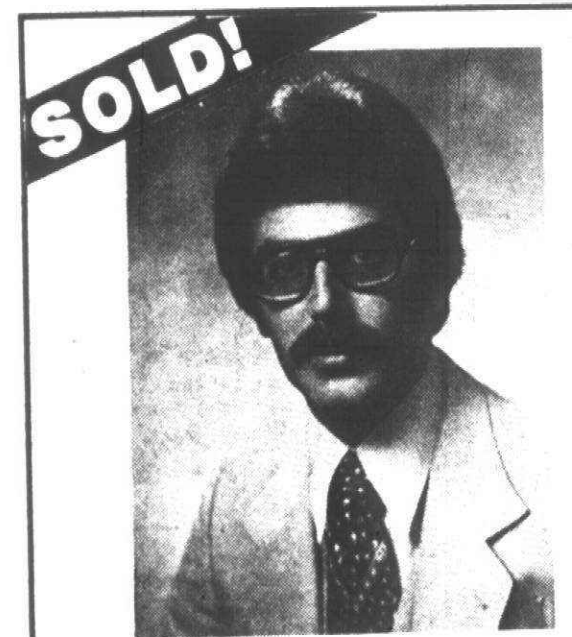
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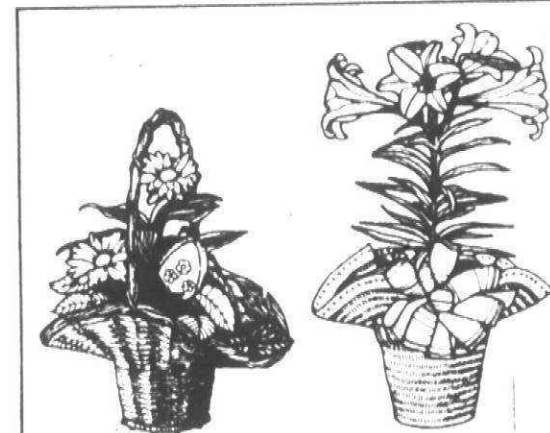
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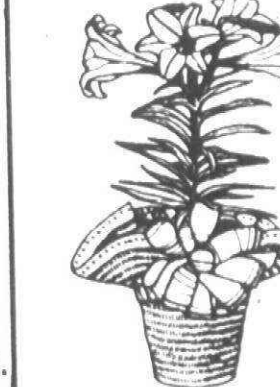

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Schoolcraft salaries lag behind counterparts

If Oakland Community College faculty salaries are the Cadillac of area two-year schools, one might label Schoolcraft College a Ford sedan.

Among OCC's 302 faculty, 50 earned \$40,000 or more last year, including six who topped \$50,000.

The top OCC faculty salary was \$55,686, while at Schoolcraft the top salary among the 160 full-time faculty was \$35,373.

This newspaper recently examined compiled earnings of Schoolcraft faculty and administrators under terms of a new state law making such records public.

The college administration provided the salary information from employees' W-2 forms for 1979.

THE HIGHEST paid Schoolcraft official is President C. Nelson Grote at \$49,250. He is also provided a car for college business.

Schoolcraft vice-presidents W. Kenneth Lindner (\$43,374), Jewell E. Stindt (\$41,500) and Edward V. McNally (\$40,618) also top the \$40,000 mark. Dr. Stindt, who is also provost, began her tenure at the college in September.

Among full-time faculty, 21 — or 13 percent — earned more than \$30,000 last year, topped by Culinary Arts instructor James Van Vuren, \$35,373, and apprenticeship instructor Kenneth Schultz, \$33,326.

The remainder of the \$30,000-plus salaries ranged between \$30,012 and \$31,840.

Among 35 Schoolcraft administrators, 21 — or 60 percent — earned more

than \$30,000 last year, ranging from Culinary Arts Assistant Dean Robert Breithaupt at \$30,054 to Evening Operations Dean Fred Stefanski, \$39,188.

Seventy-three Schoolcraft instructors — or 45 percent — earned between \$25,000 and \$30,000 last year, while 37 percent (59 instructors) made between \$20,000 and \$25,000.

"FRANKLY, WE think we're good and we think we're worth more," said electronics instructor Delavan W. Sipes, president of the Faculty Forum, the instructors' union.

"We have lost ground repeatedly as far as keeping up with inflationary costs."

The union, affiliated with the Michigan Education Association, will be negotiating its contract with Schoolcraft this year. The current pact expires at the end of August.

There have been two faculty strikes at Schoolcraft, the most recent in 1978, since the Faculty Forum organized 12 years ago.

"OUR FACULTY are in the top two or three (among southeast Michigan community colleges) as far as base salaries," said Grote. Base salaries are the minimum paid under a contract, depending on an instructor's seniority and qualifications.

Grote explained that some large differences exist between Schoolcraft salaries and those at neighboring Oakland Community College because of the latter's different method of computing "overload" pay for faculty.

Full-time instructors earn "overload" when they exceed the minimum

number of class teaching hours, have large classes, handle night classes and teach in summer sessions.

Sipes said supplemental pay at Schoolcraft (\$14 an hour when an instructor teaches more than 16 hours a week) is "abominably low... the lowest in southeast Michigan."

At OCC, the supplemental rate for overload ranges from \$12 to \$19 an hour, which is multiplied by the number of extra students over an instructor's minimum credit hour load for a semester.

SCHOOLCRAFT HAS about 190 part-time faculty, for whom the top scale is \$14 an hour.

Grote said the western Wayne college is "not competitive in part-time."

"We are not paying at the level we

must pay in order to attract and hold qualified part-time faculty," he said.

Sipes said the school's part-time instructors, who start at \$12.50 an hour when first hired, are "on the bottom of the (pay) list" for metropolitan area community colleges.

"From an economic standpoint," says Sipes, it's "cheaper" for the college to use part-time faculty. Depending on the semester, up to 225 part-time faculty have been hired at Schoolcraft.

Referring to the number of part-time instructors hired, Grote said, "They're out there and available. That's part of it."

"The question always is balance (between part- and full-time instructors)," he continued. "That raises a very basic question of economics."

He said a mixture of part- and full-time faculty is good for the school's academic program, particularly if some part-time instructors are "practicing professionals" from business and industry.

SEVENTY PERCENT of full-time Schoolcraft instructors are men. Among the 113 men, 69 percent earned \$25,000 or more last year, while 36 percent of the 47 women did.

Citizens' voices were loud enough to be heard

In all likelihood, some kind of bond proposal will return to the ballot in the June school election.

An election will be held to elect two members to the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education. The cost of adding a ballot proposal would be minimal.

It would make sense if the bond proposal submitted to voters for approval is similar to Proposition I, which was defeated by a narrow 555 votes March 27.

CLEARLY THE CITIZENS want nothing to do with building new classrooms.

If the special election last Thursday said anything at all, the 6-1 defeat of Proposition II was a message — loud and clear — that voters want growth to be accommodated without new construction.

But no such clear mandate emerged from the vote on Proposition I. That proposal asked approval to borrow \$14½ million to expand year-round school, buy portable classrooms and buses, and other expenses to accommodate student growth.

The narrowness of the defeat suggests voters were almost evenly divided and undecided.

The school board should consider a sister-proposal to make sure voters really have a chance to put their seal of approval on the future direction of the school district.

If a similar proposal is defeated a second time around, it will be time for the board to bite the bullet and implement harsh alternatives.

THE IDEA OF earmarking a half-mill for maintenance was a good one. But voters thought otherwise, rejecting Proposition III by a 4-3 margin.

The board and administration thought it would be wise to earmark funds for maintenance for a 10-year period. The money would have been "frozen" in the budget and unavailable to employee union groups during negotiations.

But that approach has been tried three times and

three times rejected by the electorate. A 4-3 defeat is not overwhelming, so the board might well want to try again. The effort should be made only if the board is convinced it failed in explaining to voters the reason for earmarking the funds.

The Observer recognizes that sometimes the electorate is uninformed and can make a mistake in a single election. So we support giving voters a second chance. But we do not approve of indiscriminately bringing defeated issues back to voters, again and again, without good reason.

The Observer believes there is good reason to bring back to voters a second version of Proposition I. There may be good reason for bringing back to voters Proposition III, but the Observer is waiting for justification for doing so from the school board.

WHATEVER THE BOARD decides to do, the Observer hopes one lesson has been learned from last Thursday's balloting:

School boards are elected by the people to *make decisions*. The citizens will judge the merit of those decisions when it's time for trustees to seek re-election.

The tragedy of the defeat of Proposition II is that it never should have been on the ballot. The reason it was there was that some trustees thought "the people should decide." They passed the buck to the people because they were unwilling to make a tough decision.

Yet the evidence was clear, from past elections and from opinion polls, that the majority of voters were not going to support a plan similar to Proposition II.

Because the board was indecisive, the electorate may have been reflecting that same inability to make a final decision. Hopefully the school board will do a better job of representing citizens by making hard decisions before asking the electorate for its stamp of approval in June.

U-D forgets Gus Dorais

Sitting with Tom Dorais at the luncheon table the other day brought back many fond memories for The Stroller and called his attention once again to one of the most rank injustices of all time on the sports scene.

Tom, now an official of the Pontiac division of General Motors, is the son of Gus Dorais, the legendary football figure who teamed with Knute Rockne to form the most famous forward passing team of all time on the collegiate football fields.

Gus Dorais took over the coaching duties at the University of Detroit in 1925 when the team practiced on the cinders along the railroad tracks below Jefferson Avenue. And in three years he lifted the team to such prominence that at the end of the 1928 season when it was undefeated, it was considered for the Rose Bowl.

Yet, despite the outstanding coaching job and the prominence it brought to the university, there is nothing on the campus to remember him except a small picture on the wall of Calihan Hall.

IT IS A SHAME. Not only is the Dorais name just about forgotten on the campus, but the stadium in which his teams won their greatest victories is now just a memory, too.

Along the way Dorais developed two All-American players in Lloyd Brazil, a great halfback, and Vince Banonis, a center whom Grantland Rice once called the best center he ever had seen.

In the fall of 1925, shortly after he had arrived in Detroit to begin his stroll on a metropolitan newspaper as a member of the Free Press sports department, The Stroller was assigned to cover the University of Detroit football team.

At that time, the school was located on East Jefferson, and the football team practiced along the railroad tracks close to the river.

One afternoon, The Stroller was told to report early the next day. The reason: the team was going to drill in the new stadium — officially named Dinan Field in honor of its donor — out on Six Mile Road and Livernois.

SLOWLY, AND QUIETLY, Dorais started to build his football machine. In three short years, he developed a squad that was called one of the strongest independents.

In 1928 the team went undefeated. In fact, after losing to both Army and Notre Dame early in 1927, the team ran up a string of 22 consecutive victories. It was the longest string in college football at the time.

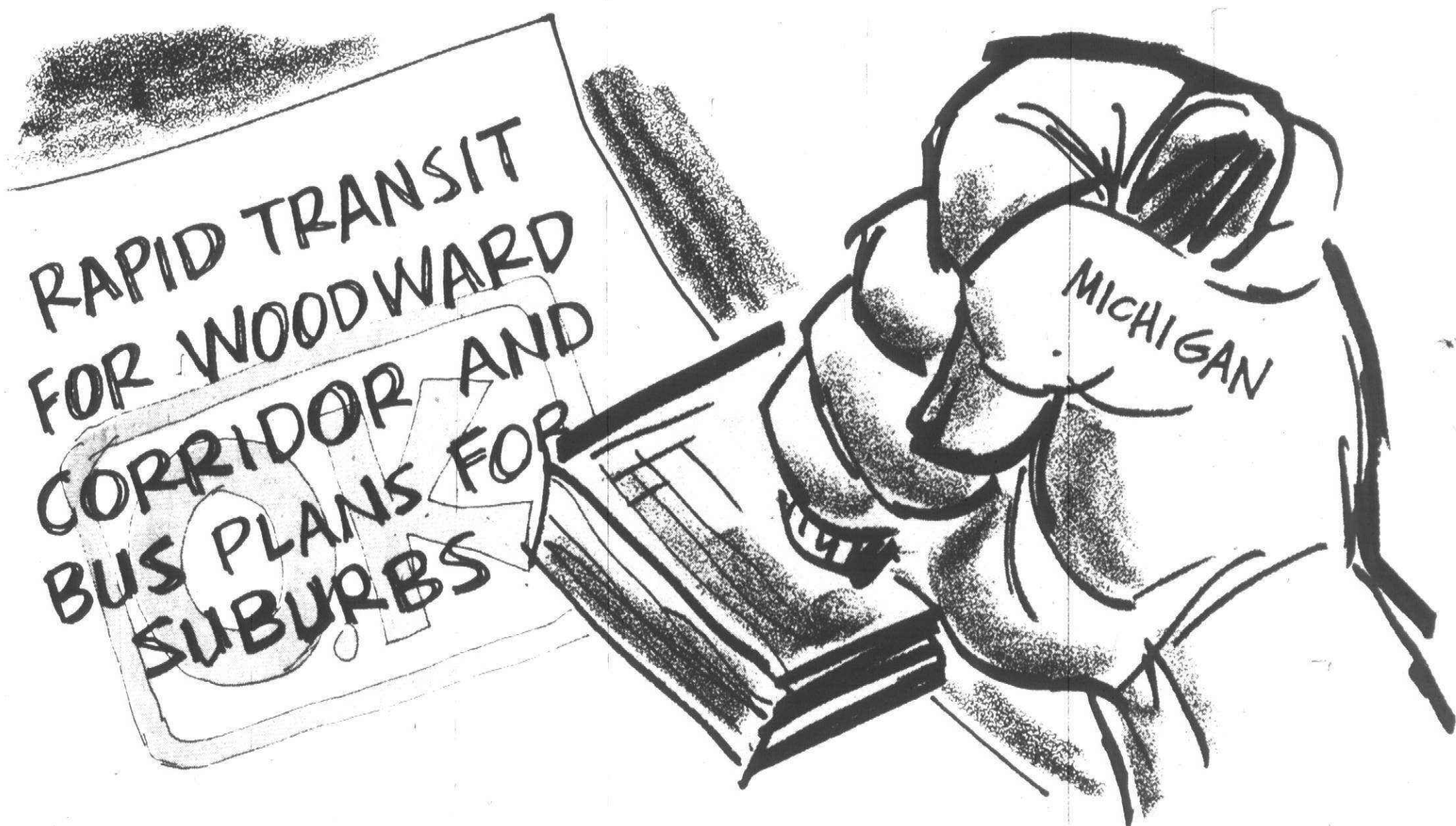
This great success left Dorais in a quandary. No other teams wanted to play him. Dorais attended a meeting of the intercollegiate coaches in New York, got on the floor and dared anyone to bring his team to Detroit. There was no response.

So dedicated did Dorais become that he once turned down an offer to take the coaching job at Princeton University where he could have had the benefit of the nation's top press. He said he hadn't finished the job in Detroit that he had signed on to do.

And so great was his hold on people that he set another record. He had the same assistants, the same trainer, and the same newspapermen covering him for 17 seasons. His hold on folks also took him to a seat on the Detroit Common Council where Billy Rogell, veteran of that body, lists Dorais as one of the 10 best he ever has served with at the council table.

This is the man who is the unsung hero at the University of Detroit and it is about time that a marker be erected somewhere on the campus so that he never will be forgotten.

No one is more entitled to it.



How will history view transit vote?

The losers made it sound as if Michigan politics had hit a historic low March 27 when the House of Representatives passed the first funding for a SEMTA light rail system.

The session lasted more than seven hours. Members were locked into the chamber. Representatives were promised no opposition if they voted yes or threatened with big war chests if they voted no. There were promises of judgeships and buildings for local colleges. One member was brought in from the hospital.

Historically, however, it was no big deal.

There was a wilder session in 1962 when the state Senate passed an income tax bill. It's not mentioned in the history books. When the Continental Congress passed the Declaration of Independence, one member, whose face was covered because it was rotting from cancer, got off his deathbed to vote.

If the SEMTA light rail plan is mentioned in the history books, it won't be because of the wheeling-dealing politics of our beloved legislature.

WHAT'S MORE LIKELY to be remembered are some of the other things that accompanied the SEMTA plan.

In the last year, gasoline passed \$1 a gallon, and it won't be long before it hits \$2 a gallon. That fact is far more relevant than the politics in Lansing.

The late 1970s and early '80s will go down in history as the time the bottom dropped out of the suburban housing market. It will be known as the time the paving of orchards slowed down drastically.

It will be known as the time when 85 percent of the population could no longer afford a new house, a time when buyers became renters or owners of more compact housing.

It will be known as a time when school districts lost one-third of their populations, a time when school buildings only five or 10 years old were shut down or converted into community centers.

It will be known as a time when the brakes were applied to urban sprawl.

It will be known as a time when Michigan finished off its freeway system and began building a transit system for a more compact, more citified population.

WHAT IS SO unbelievable is not that there were arm-twistings and vote trading to pass the transit package.

The astounding fact is that Michigan is many decades behind other parts of the nation and world in providing a modern transit system for a world-class metropolis.

But Michigan is finally acting, and that will be in the history books. There are many other political hurdles before the first electric train begins running.

An alternative for Ch. 56

The next five years are going to be tough ones for public television in metro Detroit.

The disinterest is creeping in as viewers turn their backs on "alternative" viewing.

The obvious sign was the result of last week's Channel 56 annual auction. The folks down on Second Avenue are smiling hard and trying to put the best face on the situation.

But it doesn't look good. While raising \$3,000 more than it did last year, the station came up \$70,000 short of its \$750,000 goal. The three grand is peanuts when inflation is considered.

STATION OFFICIALS admit that small businesses weren't donating higher priced items as in previous years. The station says businesses "weren't able" to donate higher-priced items because of the uncertain economy.

But what business really was saying was that it "wasn't willing" to donate higher priced items.

There's a big difference between "able" and "willing."

When business loses faith in an advertising outlet, which Channel 56 is during the auction, the outlet's financial situation turns sour.

Only one good reason for that exists — business doesn't believe viewers are watching. It's the rating game all over again.

THE AUCTION results are only a symptom of public television's real problem — cable and pay television.

Already viewers are turning to pay television for their "alternative." Throughout the metro area, pay and cable television companies are swooping down, gulping up viewer interest and money.

And pay television is offering what the general public wants to see — sports, first-run movies — especially the "R" rated — and concert performances by big name stars.

Even network television is shivering at this fast-paced alternative. A cable group nearly outbid NBC for the Moscow Olympics.

Political concerns aside, the real possibility existed that millions of Americans could have ended

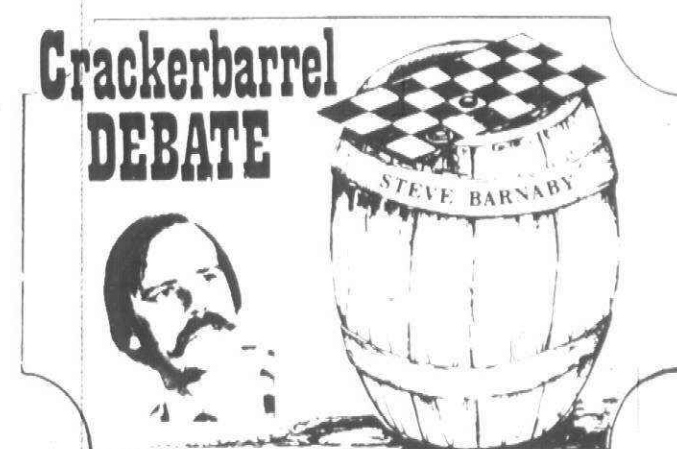
ning. But it is inevitable that rapid transit is coming. Our economy and society are ready.

Among those who helped make history are four suburban representatives: Alice Tomboulion of Oakland Township, Joe Forbes of Oak Park, John Bennett of Redford Township and Tom Brown of Westland. They voted yes.

Mrs. Tomboulion, in particular, will take a lot of heat for her vote. Much of her north Oakland district still thinks this is 1955 and dreams that gasoline will drop back to 35 cents a gallon.

Big things are happening — bigger than in the 1820s, the 1880s, the 1910s and a lot of other decades. The late 1970s and early '80s will loom large in the history books.

But not because of the rough politicking one afternoon in Lansing.

Television soothsayers predict that in a decade or so, we all will be paying to watch the old boob tube, and we'll get the commercials anyway.

Obviously, public television is unable to compete with what pay TV has to offer. It's just too expensive. But as long as everybody is going to end up paying to watch, 56 must reconsider its alternatives — alternatives for which viewers are willing to fork over the bucks to pay and watch.

Word at the station is that new president and general manager Jack Caldwell wants to "jazz up" the 56 image, as one staff member put it.

Caldwell, who has something of a reputation as a public television wonder boy, could do the job.

A SOUND ALTERNATIVE is to develop what local television does best — present good local programs, including the news.

Away with British soap operas and nature specials. Get out on the street and see what's happening in metro Detroit. News has been the bread and butter for years at local stations. There's no reason that Channel 56 should be any different.

There are a lot of different ways of covering the news. Three of the local stations show us one way. Channel 56 can show us another.

Expensive? Sure. But now is the time to try it. Or public television in Detroit could be just a memory.

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We've all seen Renaissance Center, and maybe photographed it, but how many thought to look at it from this angle, seeing flagpoles as well as build-

How I got to know my in-laws indirectly

I never knew Max and Evelyn Krieger. They died two years before I met the product of their union, Byron.

After 22 years of marriage to their son, I know Max and Evelyn Krieger well.

Regardless of current psychological trends which deny that children become similar to those who raise them, I strongly believe every adult is made up of parental or parent-figure fragments, for better or worse.

I substantiate this by studies which reveal that infants deprived of physical contact and love often fail to survive. If these affection-starved infants live, their names frequently are printed on the Most Wanted list of criminals by the time they are 18.

How many parents have witnessed their own blazing tempers or recognized their own sense of humor within their offspring? Yet they're not seeing genes, but attitudes learned from observation.

WHILE I MAINTAINED I would marry only a man whose character and disposition resembled my father's, I knew when I succeeded in finding this gem, that the man I married could only imitate his own father. Therefore, Max Krieger must have been

somewhat like my own father, bequeathing his son those desirable traits.

Evelyn Krieger must have been a quietly, gentle, loving person since she imbued her son with the ability tenderly to care for his own children without tarnishing his masculine armor.

Max Krieger came from Russia in 1901. At 8 he was a perfect candidate for the czar's army, and his father, Berel Lazer, didn't care for this to happen. Jews weren't winning any popularity polls in Russia, and the czar's "cure" for Jewishness was to remove the child from his home for army training.

So they came to America, where Max Krieger

married, raised four sons and buried a small daughter somewhere near Toronto, Ontario. He didn't live to know his Catholic daughter-in-law.

HIS CATHOLIC daughter-in-law had second thoughts after eight years of marriage.

As that daughter-in-law, I had to re-evaluate my own beliefs because, even though I would never know my father-in-law, I had married his son and was the mother of his grandchildren. Could I allow his journey from Russia in order to preserve his Jewish family to be in vain?

The decision might have been an extremely painful one. I might have felt I was betraying my own parents had I not known and told them I was becoming a Jew because I wanted to observe the laws of Torah which would enable me to serve God to the best of my ability, an objective my parents had always stressed.

In a recent conversation, my mother laughingly told me about her new friend whose jaw dropped a mile when Mom elaborated about her family.

"My son's a priest; my youngest daughter is divorced," Mom began. As the woman listened intently, Mom threw her the punch line: "And my oldest

daughter is an Orthodox Jew."

"Oh, dear!" gasped Mom's friend. "Do you ever see each other? You must argue terribly. How could you ever get along?"

"With love and respect," revealed my wise mother. "We raised our children always to love and respect each other as individuals, and I guess you might have called us a rather progressive family."

AT PASSOVER, I remember the times my parents would visit and carefully bring only items marked "Kosher for Passover." They would munch matzos even though they didn't care for the texture or the taste.

I remember the Passover Mom scrubbed floors with me until 2 a.m. because the house had to be ready or "pesadik" by the following evening, and she refused to go to bed until it was finished.

Special? You bet. I wish my parents had known Max and Evelyn Krieger. They would have liked each other.

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80-year family firm converts to save energy

The days when Bill Ruehr and his father traveled to Eastern Market in Detroit along the Grand River trail are over.

It was there that they would unload their potted plants, raised from seeds, for sale.

Gone also are the days when the men stayed up all hours of the night to insure that their fledgling Easter lilies had just the right nurturing.

Also gone are the days when Heidi's Flowers and Greenhouses, built in 1899, would grace the Old Village section of Plymouth as one of the oldest greenhouses in western Wayne County.

That's because what was an 80-year tradition, as of last week, has been changed — or rather, adopted — to changing times.

Ruehr recently completed a four-year renovation project that converted the greenhouses into a mini-mall of eight specialty shops.

The flower shop remains as a remnant of that family tradition although now the flowers are bought from other distributors.

Usually, such a change-over could be attributed to today's business climate where an array of specialty shops could be viewed as having more success potential than a single business.

Well, that's part of it.

More than that, however, the conversion stems from something that's affecting all Americans today, not just business owners.

IT'S DIRECTLY attributed to rising utility prices.

Ruehr says he initiated the remodeling four years ago because he couldn't see paying any longer thousands of dollars in heat bills.

At that time, it cost about \$8,000 annually to see that the greenhouse was adequately heated.

Today, he estimates, those yearly bills would have tripled — to \$27,000 — if he hadn't taken measures to change the business.

Ruehr adds, without hesitation, that his business is just one small victim of rising energy prices within the greenhouse industry.

Most Midwest growers, he says, have moved to the West coast and even to foreign countries such as those in South America to beat rising heat costs.

About the conversion, Ruehr says his father "would have been proud."

Reinhold Ruehr, who died in 1975, emigrated from Germany in 1926 and some 13 years later bought the Heidi Greenhouses from Carl Heidi, the original owner.

"The funny thing is," says Ruehr, "he came over to get away from the inflation over there."

"He was a hard worker and went out working hard," recalls his son. "He loved the activity of a business."

THE MINI-MALL on N. Mill Avenue now houses Austin Vacuum Cleaners, The Village Stripper, Miller's Upholstery, Plymouth Drapery, Forever Yours Gift Shop, Old Village Sausage Shop, Wildwood Imports as well as Heidi's Flower Shop.

In the conversion process, individual shop spaces were built, insulation was added, and carpeting was laid. Though not an experienced mason, Ruehr built brick posts around some medal piping on the storefront.

And, of course, the heat bills have dropped. Last year's total amount was \$4,200.

Ruehr, who now lives in Westland with his wife, MaryAnn, recalls the days when he grew up in Old Village in a small frame house directly across the street from the greenhouses.

Since he was in the seventh grade, he worked in the shop.

Rising at 3:30 in the morning, the family men would travel to Eastern Market to sell their plants. In those days, Eastern's business was primarily wholesale trade. Today, the market is one of Detroit's most popular stomping grounds for consumers.

"Then Grand River was only 35 miles per hour and we tried not to hit every stop light."

In the evenings, they kept a close check on specialty plants such as Easter lilies.

"In the old days you planted them in November and sat with them every night. When they were late, you had to be there to push up the heat to 72 degrees."

DURING HIS recollection, a truck pulled up in front of the shop, loaded with full grown lilies.

As if sighing over the amount of work once required in raising them, he adds: "Now they're here and next Saturday they'll be gone."

Solid hurling key as Chiefs ready for Cincinnati swing

A trip to Cincinnati will give Plymouth Canton baseball coach Fred Crissey a good indication of exactly where his team stands.

The Chiefs will play six games starting at noon Saturday at Reading.

"We felt these kids deserved the trip," said Crissey, now in his seventh season as Canton coach. "Something like this brings us closer together as a team."

Crissey likes the attitude of this year's squad.

"This is our most veteran club since 1978," he said.

Pitching is the key according to Crissey. This year's staff must replace the arms of Scott Dawson and Brian James, now attending the University of Michigan and Michi-

gan State, respectively.

"We have more good arms this year than we've had in the last four," said the Canton coach. "These kids have the potential. I'm very encouraged. They have God-given ability."

The ace of the staff could be Dan Funkhouser, a rangy lefthander who has grown taller and stronger during the off season.

"He'll definitely be one of our better kids," Crissey said. Another senior with some experience is righthander Guy Kananen. Junior hurlers who will get a long look are Dave Malek and Jerry Norgren, both righthanders. Backup help will be provided by junior Sean Hopper and sophomores Danny Smith and Jamie Chilcoff.

"We're going to try to get a line on these kids on our trip," he said.

SENIOR FRANK McMurray inherits the catching spot after seeing action most of last season as designated hitter. The 6-foot-1, 190-pounder hit .335 as a part-timer and "we feel he'll be outstanding for us," according to Crissey. Senior Tim Racer, an all-purpose player, will back up McMurray.

Hoping to bounce back for a banner senior season is veteran first baseman Dave Meador. Bothered by a painful shoulder injury last year which required surgery in the off season, Meador still was able to bat over .300.

"He seems fully recovered," said Crissey. "He worked on weights and went through therapy."

Meador, a good fielder, hopes to regain the form which made him an All-Western Six League choice as a

Young Salem baseball squad to get baptism under fire

Plymouth Salem baseball coach Brian Gilles is counting on his young and inexperienced team to learn in a hurry.

With many new faces in the lineup, the Rocks will open up the 1980 prep season next Thursday at home against Royal Oak Kimball.

"We're all kind of new," said Gilles, whose team posted a 19-6 record last year that included Suburban Eight League and district Class A titles. "We're so young. We'll need good solid pitching early to take the pressure off the rest."

Salem will build around veteran infielders Jim Anderson and Mike Woodard, both senior co-captains.

Anderson, a 6-foot-3, 205-pounder, will supply the power. He hit for a .380 average last season while smashing five home runs. The All-Leaguer is also sharp with the glove from his familiar first base post.

"Having Jim out there is like having a coach on the field," said Gilles.

"He has good, soft hands and a good arm," said Gilles. "He worked on weights in the off season. We're aiming to cut down on his strike outs this year."

The pitching staff is led by Pat McNamara, a tall, rangy lefthander who transferred from Bishop Borgess. He will also see plenty of duty in the outfield.

Jeff Primeau, another senior, returns as the team's most experienced pitcher. The Salem lefty saw action last season in the bullpen for Gilles. Fully recovered from a broken arm which kept him out his entire junior year is Paul Stevenson, a righthander. He is being counted on as a starter along with McNamara and Primeau.

Junior pitchers vying for spots include John Penders, Jim Jimmerson, Ken MacDonald and Greg Etienne. All four juniors performed on Salem's

Plymouth outscored an outmanned Dearborn squad, 13-3, in the final period to win going away.

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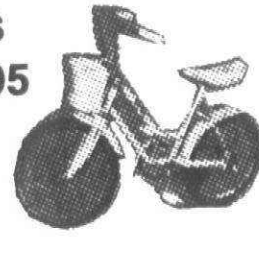


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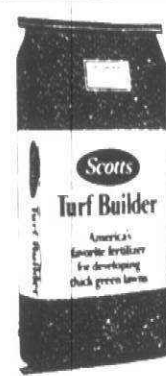
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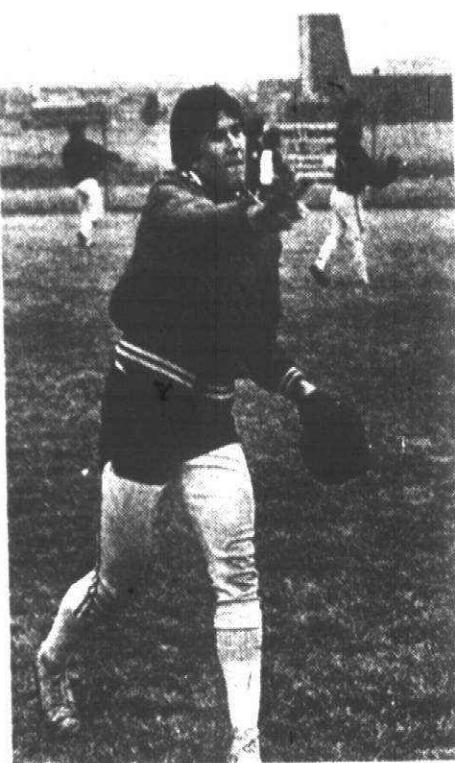
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Anderson, Woodard key Salem offense

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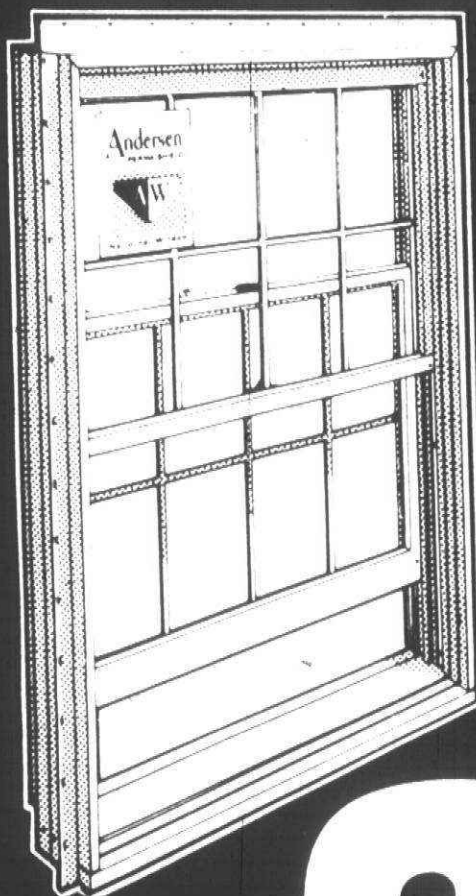
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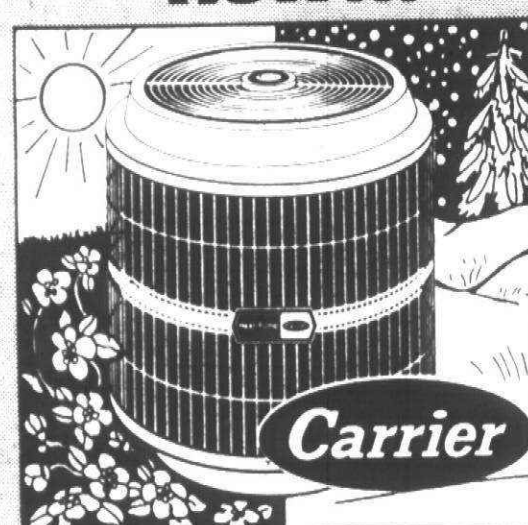
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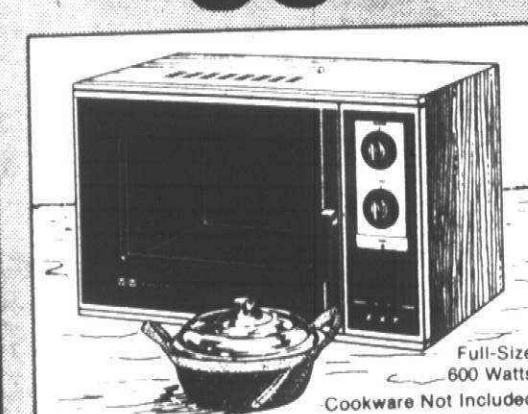
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If the efforts of the American Bowling Congress succeed, bowling will be included in the 1988 Olympic Games.

During the past week, ABC officials have asked to put on an exhibition at the 1984 games. If the bid is accepted, there is a better than even chance that the Olympic body will honor the 10-pin sport.

Under the format of the Olympic Games, any new applicant must put on an exhibition; if successful, the sport will be honored.

If the exhibition is approved, it won't be the first time that bowlers competed before Olympic officials. Back in 1936, Joe Norris and Walter Reppenhagen of the Stroh team, were members of a team that staged an exhibition in Berlin prior to the games. It was interesting but fruitless. So, now another bid is being made.

WOMEN'S BOWLING on a national scale got a big boost a few days ago when the Avon Co., a major cosmetics firm, agreed to sponsor the annual Queens Tournament that is the major part of the Women's International Bowling Congress tournament.

Both Kuhn and Osborn emphasized that instruction will be given to small groups, ideally limited to 25 participants each.

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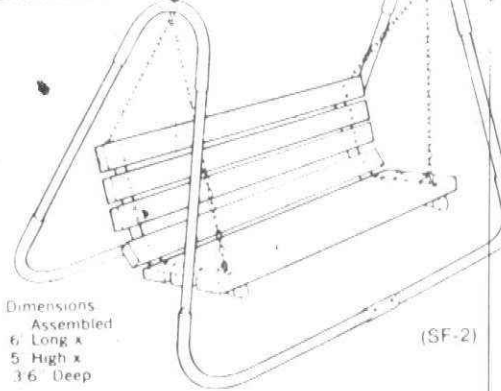
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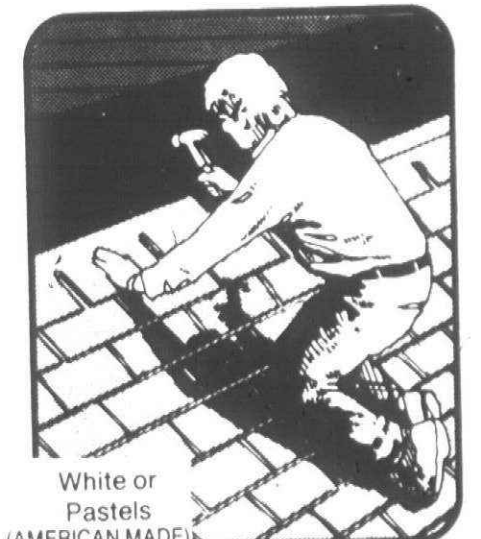
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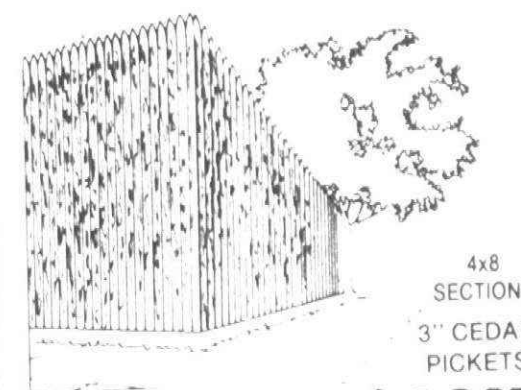


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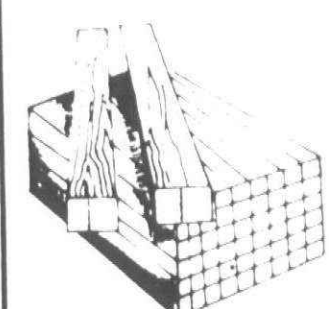
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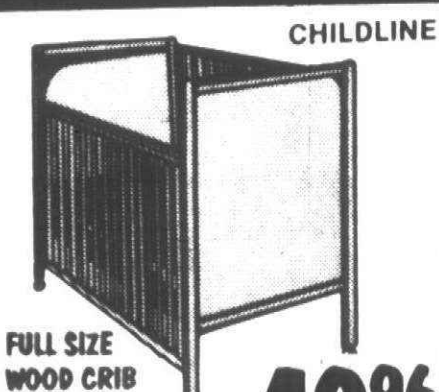
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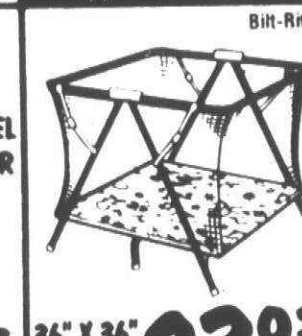
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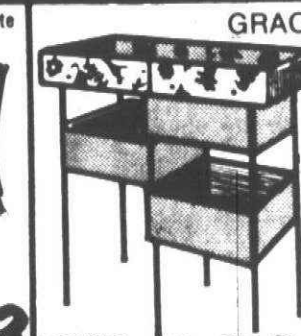
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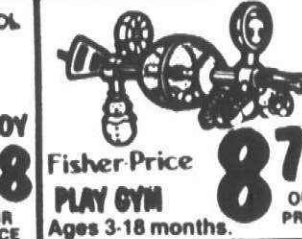
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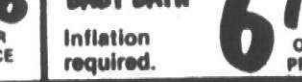
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Keglers crowned in ESY tourney

Track legend burned up U-M track

Since the death earlier this week of Jesse Owens, the legendary black sprinter who won four gold medals in the 1936 Olympic Games, the editorial writers and TV commentators have unleashed a flood of words extolling his performances on and off the athletic field.

They have told of his amazing performances in 1936 when he set Olympic records and became the most talked about athlete of his time. Since then he has been linked with such all-time greats as Jim Thorpe, Red Grange, Babe Ruth, Jack Dempsey, Joe Louis and Gordie Howe.

They have told of his work after retiring from athletic competition and credited him with being a crusader for the amateur athletes.

But few of them mentioned very much about the greatest feat of his

career. It was the afternoon of May 25, 1935, in the Big Ten track meet on Ferry Field at the University of Michigan.

Running as a sophomore from Ohio State University, he broke three world records and tied another in the space of 45 minutes. No one before, or since, has come close to matching that performance on the athletic track.

And the strange part of the feat is that Jesse was not satisfied and felt that he would have broken the fourth record if Ralph Young, Michigan State athletic director, had been taller.

When it came time for the broad jump, or the long jump as they call it now, Jesse set his goal at 27 feet — more than a foot farther than the existing world record.

When he completed the jump and learned that he had broken the

world record by half a foot, with a leap of 26 feet 8 1/4 inches, he walked over to the Michigan State official and in a rather disappointing voice said: "Mr. Young, I wish you were two inches taller."

Ralph laughed, feeling that his height had nothing to do with the leap. But Jesse explained: "I looked at you as I got ready and figured if I reached the peak of my arc even with the top of your head, I'd do 27 feet. I misjudged. That's why I wish you were two inches taller. I would have made it."

Aside from that disappointment, Owens' performance that afternoon may have set a standard for all time. Here is what he did in those famous 45 minutes:

3.15 p.m. — won 100-yard dash in 9.4 seconds to equal the world record.

3.25 p.m. — won the long jump

with leap of 26 feet 8 1/4 inches, a half foot more than previous world record.

3.34 p.m. — won the 220-yard dash in 20.3 seconds to better the world record by three-tenths of a second.

4.00 p.m. — won 220-yard low hurdles in 22.6 seconds, which bettered the world record by two-fifths of a second.

These marks have all been bettered since that afternoon, though the long jump mark stood for 25 years.

His Olympic feat, at the time, was outstanding, but that afternoon of May 25 on Ferry Field in Ann Arbor — three world records and an equal record — may be the greatest single performance by an athlete of all time.

And it is too bad that Ralph Young wasn't two inches taller.

A new product, Prince's Superoni, is one I had noticed on the shelves for several months and finally decided to try. Advertised as containing 41 percent more protein than hamburger, it is made of soy and, unlike most spaghetti products, stays with you for a long time. Cooking time is about seven minutes. Be careful. It softens quickly if you go beyond that. It requires close attention during the cooking process.

The taste is basically the same as regular pasta. I didn't tell my family I was trying something new. My husband noticed something was different, but the children didn't and they ate everything in front of them. It's worth trying.

My sister-in-law told me about "No Yolks" cholesterol-free noodle substitute. She said you can't tell the difference between this and the real thing. In addition to being cholesterol free, one serving contains one gram less fat than the conventional product. They are made from wheat flour, corn flour and egg whites.

ACCORDING TO food industry sources, low-calorie, reduced-fat cake mixes will be the next hottest item to hit the store shelves. Mixing and baking directions are to remain the same. Imagine a low-calorie cake! What's next?

And if you think a low-cal cake is far out, wait till you hear this. How about a cottonseed protein bread. This product will provide up to 60 percent more protein per loaf than other white or wheat breads. Toasted cottonseed kernels will give the bread a mild, nut-like flavor. You'll also see cottonseed buns, rolls, cookies, candies and snack foods. Right now, they are available in Texas and are expected to spread across geographical United States.

THE U.S. government has released its dietary guidelines. If followed, they could improve American eating habits and maintain health. They include:

- Eat a variety of foods.

- Maintain ideal weight.
- Avoid too much fat, saturated fat and cholesterol.

- Eat foods with adequate starch and fiber.
- Avoid too much sodium.
- Avoid too much alcohol.

If you drink alcohol, do so in moderation. According to Surgeon General Julius B. Richmond of the U.S. Public Health Service, "the problems of heart and blood vessel diseases . . . and obesity can be traced to our diets."

These seniors try a new life style

Ninety years ago, when Helen Goodman's parents were married, friends and neighbors gave them a clock for their mantel. The clock faithfully ticked out the years of their lives, and went to Mrs. Goodman on their deaths, along with many other pieces of antique furniture.

For many years, it was in her home on Penniman Avenue. It went with her when she moved to Dearborn, and today it's with her in an entirely new setting — one her parents, accustomed to large houses with plenty of room for three generations and all their possessions, could never have imagined.

The new setting is called "congregate" housing. The location is the new Plymouth Towne Apartments, 107 Haggerty Road, Plymouth.

Congregate housing, explained Charles Herbert, manager of the new apartments and associate administrator of the Hendry Convalescent Center next door, is comparable to apartment hotel living.

There is no age limit. The apartments are designed to meet the needs of the "well elderly."

The monthly rental includes lunch and dinner each day.

"People who live alone often don't cook proper meals for themselves," explained Herbert. "A lot of people coming into nursing homes would never be there if they had eaten properly."

"Diet is important; so is social interrelation."

HERBERT IS hoping that the apartment building will be large enough (70 apartments are available, with 17 now

occupied) to provide for opportunities for getting to know others, yet not be so large that it will be impersonal.

Also included in the monthly rental are all utilities, except telephone, transportation services, and apartment cleaning. Each apartment has its own heating and air-conditioning system, and there are emergency call cords in bathrooms and bedrooms.

Cost of a one-bedroom apartment for one person is \$690-\$720 a month; a two-bedroom apartment is \$900. The cost for each additional person is \$250. All residents are entitled to all services.

There have been delays in construction, and still to be completed in the building are a hobby and crafts room, a games room, a barber shop and a beauty shop. There will also be a doctor's office, staffed three days a week.

One large room is being set aside for meetings and for parties given by the residents. Catering will be available.

Also in the plans is a regular Sunday brunch to which residents may invite their friends. Presently, they may have friends in for lunch or dinner.

"We are trying to make this the best restaurant in Plymouth," said Herbert.

SOME RESIDENTS miss cooking their own meals, some don't. Among the former is long-time Plymouth resident Ann McGeorge, who operated a catering service for many years. She still gets a couple of calls a week from people wanting her to cater for them, although she gave up the business a year ago. But she can still keep her

hand in, as each apartment does have a small kitchen.

Natalie Drews is happy not to have to cook meals. She has always been more interested in doing other things, such as nursing. She and her husband, Ed, and Mrs. McGeorge were the first residents of the building. They moved in Nov. 28, the Drews from an apartment in Detroit.

The oldest resident is Edna Clunk, who will be 93 in July. She and Mrs.

McGeorge are neighbors and each keeps on eye on "what the other is up to."

A long-time resident of Pontiac, Mrs. Clunk's husband died last July, and she moved to Plymouth to be closer to her niece, Jackie Troutman.

Wilton and Gladys O'Callaghan made an even longer move to be close to their son, Timothy. They came to Plymouth last year from Silver Spring, Md. O'Callaghan worked for the Ford Motor Co. in Washington, D.C., for 30 years, while his wife looked after their large home and three children.

ALL SAID that giving up their homes and their yards was the hardest part of growing older. All had to give up many treasured possessions, some through sales to strangers and some given to their children. "I was surprised — didn't think my children would want anything I had," said Mrs. O'Callaghan.

All have kept only a few cherished possessions — they miss their friends more than things.

"The last things to go, though, are the ones that are closest to your heart," said Mrs. O'Callaghan. In her case it's a treasured collection of china cups and knickknacks.

There is also a china cupboard and a comfortable old rocker in the Drews' living room, along with African vases and other plants throughout the apartment. "I just can't throw away anything alive," said Mrs. Drews.

Among the treasures from her parents' and grandparents' home Mrs. Goodman has been able to keep is a cherry drop leaf table and an end table that once belonged to a Civil War general. There is also a chair which is 126

years old and will go to the Wixom Historical Museum.

In Mrs. Clunk's apartment, a walnut secretary holds a collection of Hummel figurines, as well as providing space for her correspondence and memorabilia.

When the building is fully occupied, there should be plenty of activities for the residents right at home. Herbert said there will be an activities director at the building. One project may be to set up a well-lighted sewing room. Sewing machines were among the possessions the majority of the women had not parted with, although in many cases, failing eyesight made it difficult to use them.

Announcement was made by Mable Partain, a member of the civic committee, along with Mary Childs and Martha Bentley, the chairwoman.

Members of the club are looking forward to their spring benefit luncheon and card party at 12 noon, April 28 in the Plymouth Cultural Center. Profits will be used to make contributions to groups and for scholarships.

Calvary's new worship home to be dedicated

The people of Calvary Baptist Church of Canton are so pleased with their new facilities that they will hold five weeks of celebration events, beginning with formal dedication at 3 p.m. Easter Sunday.

The special service consecrates a 1,700-seat auditorium, complete with upholstered pews, natural wood altar and lectern and new organ and piano.

The two-year, \$2-million building project also includes a suite of 11 offices for the 10-member pastoral staff and clerical personnel.

Presiding over the dedication services will be Dr. G. Douglas Routledge, pastor of the congregation for eight years. Taking part will be Canton Supervisor Noel Culbert, Daniel Tavish, church expansion director, Dr. Daniel Clifford, son of the late Patrick Clifford, former pastor, and Dr. Wendell Johnson, president of Detroit Bible College.

Ellen Roweton, vocalist who has made many sacred recordings, will provide special music.

IN COMING WEEKS the church also

plans a separate dedication for the series 350 Rodgers-Ruffatti pipe organ, visits by youth specialist Pat Hurley, evangelist Bruce Dunn and mission leader Gerald B. Griffiths, and a homecoming banquet at Fairlane Manor.

"During these five weekends of emphasis I want to point out," Dr. Routledge wrote to Calvary members and friends in a dedication brochure, "that there will be only one formal service in which we will dedicate the facility."

"All of the other gatherings have as their objective the dedication of the individuals who worship, fellowship and serve in these environs."

The organ dedication is scheduled at 6 p.m. May 4 with Don Hustad as guest artist and the banquet is planned April 26.

Dr. Dunn, who is heard on 115 radio stations and seen on several television networks and last year was named Pastor of the Year by the Moody Bible Institute, will visit next weekend. He will be speaking for 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. services Sunday and again at 7:30 p.m. Monday.

Hurley organized a youth organization known as Spectrum Ministries and

has written a number of youth manuals. He will beat Calvary for 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. services April 20 and will lead sessions at 7:30 p.m. April 21 and 22.

Dr. Griffiths, a native of Wales, has pastored in South Africa and is chairman of the International Council of the Africa Inland Mission. He will lead services April 27-29.

DURING ALL the dedication activity, the church will watch more building activity as a new home for the Plymouth Christian Academy that it operates takes shape to be ready for fall.

That building, slated to cost

\$500,000, is "just nicely started," Dr. Routledge said.

It will house the school program now being conducted in the Cady school in Westland. The academy has 28 faculty members and more than 400 students in the first through 10th grades, and Dr. Routledge said the student count is expected to double next year.

The new church facilities, designed by Birmingham architect Tom Hansz and built by Paul H. Johnson, Inc., of Southfield, have been needed because of major growth of the congregation, the pastor said.

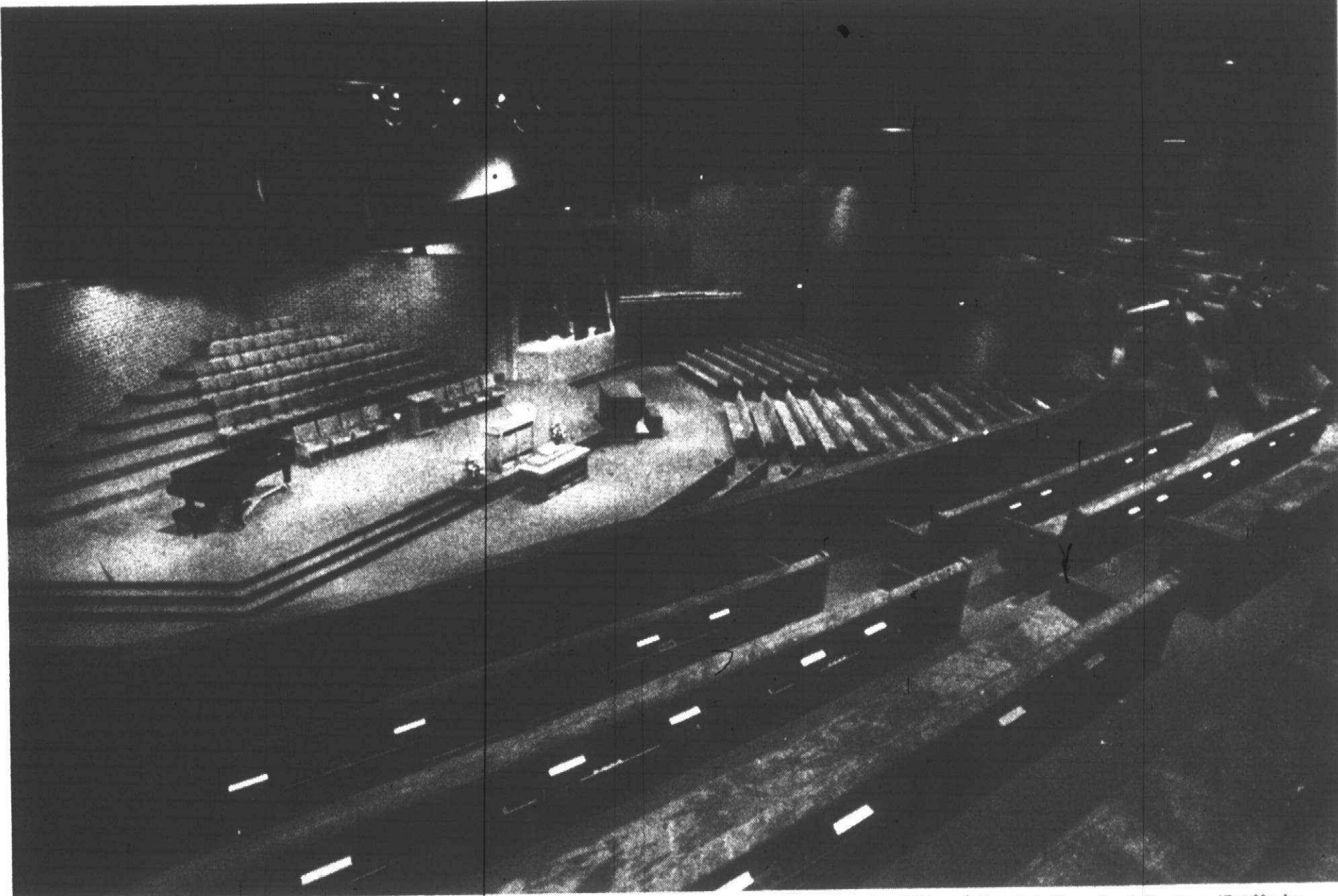
"We talk more about attendance than membership here," he said, "and last

Sunday, when we used the new auditorium for the first time, there were 1,237 present.

"We've been running regularly over 1,000 in two morning services in the former sanctuary, and evening attendance averages 800. The Bible school is now more than 700, and our budget for the current year is \$1,780,000."

The sanctuary which served the church up to now will be renamed in memory of the Rev. Patrick Clifford, who served for 22 years.

His picture will be placed above its door, with a plaque designating the room as the Clifford Memorial Auditorium.

Audience participation was invited and everyone clapped in time to the music and joined in enthusiastically.

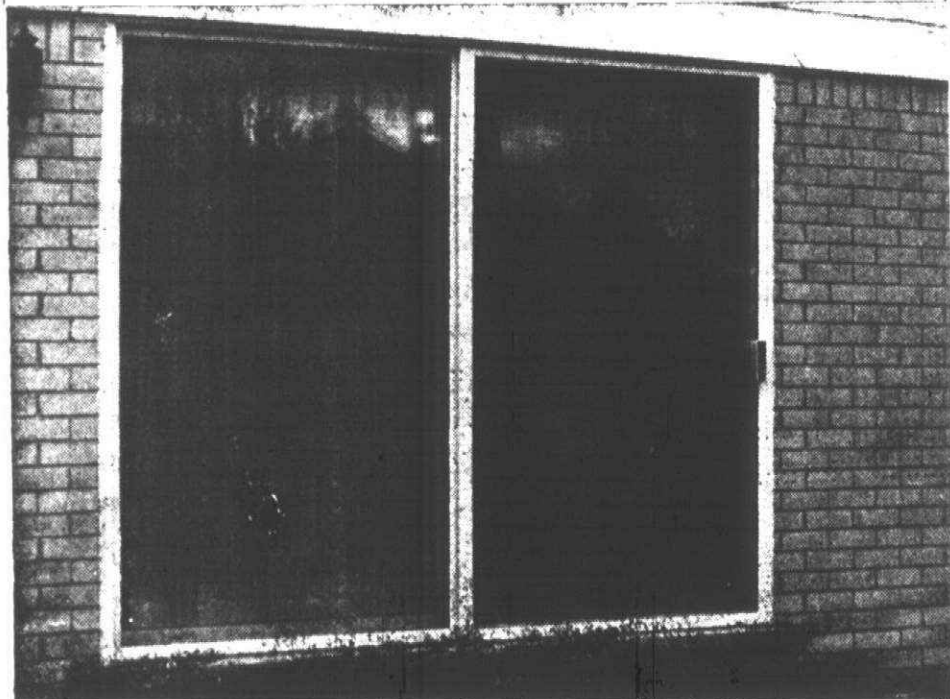

Know yourself, please yourself, advises Polly

Polly Bergen wasn't there to describe the plastic Hollywood scene. Nor did she speak about turtle oil face cream or her now defunct cosmetic line.

She didn't even tell about her acting days, her singing career or the numerous television appearances she has made.

What was on her mind when she came to Livonia Town Hall last week was her own struggle to find herself, her efforts to establish self-confidence and the process she used to come to terms with herself in order to relate to others.

"Do you like the outfit I have on today?" she began in a Loretta Young-type entrance.

The audience applauded, of course. "Well, I really don't care if you like it or not," was Miss Bergen's response.

"And the truth is I want you to leave

here today not caring whether the lady next to you likes your outfit. It's whether you like it or not that's important."

SHE USED this example to illustrate the fact that each woman goes through her entire life looking for approval. "Yes votes," she called them.

These votes, she added, come from a support system which includes husbands, lovers ("If this is your life style"), children, bosses and others.

But then the speaker noted that, statistically, some day most women end up alone.

"It's a scary, terrifying thought," she said. "And most of us who find ourselves alone are ill-prepared to deal with it. We have lived our lives being as good as others have told us that we are."

Then, she added, when the time of aloneness comes, "we are stuck with our own opinion of ourselves, and how we see ourselves."

"Sometimes we haven't even yet formed an opinion of ourselves," Miss Bergen said. It was after she was divorced at age 41 that she first found herself alone with herself.

She said she was terrified when she realized she had not grown emotionally since she was age 11 and that she had to overcome the terror of loneliness.

"AT AGE 11," she said, "I was 140 pounds, 5 feet 6 inches and had a 40-inch bust. I had an image of myself as an elephant-giraffe." She explained that this image contributed to her feeling like an outsider among her friends.

"At age 17," she went on, "I still had the image of the elephant-giraffe, and

it didn't help that by now my first show business friend was tiny Jane Powell. And Elizabeth Taylor was so beautiful, you wanted to stab her in the chest with a fork."

By this time, Miss Bergen explained, she had begun to make a name for herself in show business and began to cover up who she really was.

"I lived with the fear that some day someone would discover who I really was," she said. "I was very lonely."

But she said that today she realizes that it's what inside that counts. She used Barbra Streisand to illustrate her point.

"When Barbra started out in show business, she wore hand-me-downs from resale shops," explained Miss Bergen. "Her hair covered her eyes, and she used her long, slender hands to draw attention away from her face."

When she became successful, it wasn't long before the hair was swept back, and eventually her nose, which evidently didn't bother her, was used to her advantage. Suddenly, Ms. Streisand, made it OK to have a big nose."

LAUNCHING INTO a description of her campaign to get her act together, she advised the guests in the audience to take notes on her advice.

"Stand in front of a full length mirror (with or without a friend)," she advised, "and remove all your clothing. At this point certain things become evident."

A weight gain was the first thing that became evident to Polly Bergen.

"My body had gone to seed (flesh is more like it)," she added.

The next step was to get out a pad and pencil. "I listed my likes about

myself and my dislikes," she stated. From this list she learned to look at the things she could not change and deal with them psychologically one by one.

"For example, I always hated my legs," she said. "They are short and stumpy. But I decided to deal with it. I could conceal them in various ways. And I decided (other people's) opinions of my legs didn't matter. My opinion did."

DISCUSSING how heavy people can deal with losing weight, she reminded her listeners that almost everyone in the room has enough common sense to know what is fattening and what is the basic method for reducing.

"We are all looking for the magic wand," she noted. "That magic wand is

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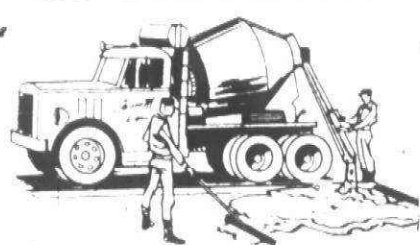

"We are all looking for the magic wand," she noted. "That magic wand is in your head. It's commonsense, discipline and caring about yourself. The secret to good dieting is to keep your mouth shut."

She said people must realize that they cannot hide from themselves. "Know who you are," she said. "Make an effort to accept what you cannot change. Change what matters if you can. If you like yourself, you'll trust your own judgment. Listen to your own common sense."

Miss Bergen advised development of positive traits.

"Learn to love people," she said. "Learn to care. Do you know how hard it is to dislike someone who is crazy about you, who has an interest in everything you do and in your ideas?"

"It has taken me 49 years," she concluded, "to learn that I am beautiful, sexy, intelligent and a warm and loving friend."

AUDIENCE response to Miss Bergen's talk was one of surprise.

"I thought she was going to talk about cosmetics," one woman said. "This took me by surprise."

Many agreed.

At the celebrity luncheon Miss Bergen answered a question by saying yes, she had cosmetic surgery.

"Every year for 20 years I had asked a plastic surgeon about cosmetic surgery," she said. "It was really an ego trip, because he'd always say I didn't need it. Then last year, when I asked him, he agreed — and I was devastated."

"But I had it done six months ago and I am very pleased."

"The only thing I would advise is be sure you have it done for the right reasons. If it makes you feel better about yourself, then yes. But it's very expensive."

It was also during the question-and-answer session that she spoke of her three adopted children (her daughter married Squiggy of television's "Laverne and Shirley" last year), her dates with Howard Hughes ("he was shy . . . and dressed wierd), religious affiliation ("you are probably looking at the only Jewish Southern Baptist"), and the Equal Rights Amendment.

"Yes, I am a strong believer," she said of ERA. "I can't believe it hasn't already been ratified. I will work every day the rest of my life to see that it is passed."

'Canterbury' lives at SC

A rare treat for Chaucer lovers will be presented at Schoolcraft College at 8 p.m. Wednesday, April 9, when Australian actor Rob Inglis performs Nevil Coghill's modern English version of "The Canterbury Tales."

Inglis' two-hour program will include the prologue; "The Tobar Inn in Southwark on a night in the 14th Century;" "The Wife of Bath" prologue; "The Wife of Bath's Tale;" "The Pardoner's Tale;" "The Nun's Priest's Tale" and "The Miller's Tale."

These selections of Chaucer's "son-dry folk" — from sublimely noble to lecherously corrupt — come alive when Inglis portrays all the characters. He satirizes the prioress, shows the pompous riding merchant's resemblance to his 20th Century counterpart and struts like a rooster.

Inglis trained in London at the Royal Shakespeare and National Royal Court Theatres. He says Chaucer is relevant for today because he was the greatest exposé of hypocrisy who ever lived.

He has been performing his one-man show, using a table and four chairs as props, all over the world for six years.

Inglis believes that Chaucer's work is "like a tonic for the wounds of today. Chaucer is realistic, ironical, but joyful."

Symposium registration begins at

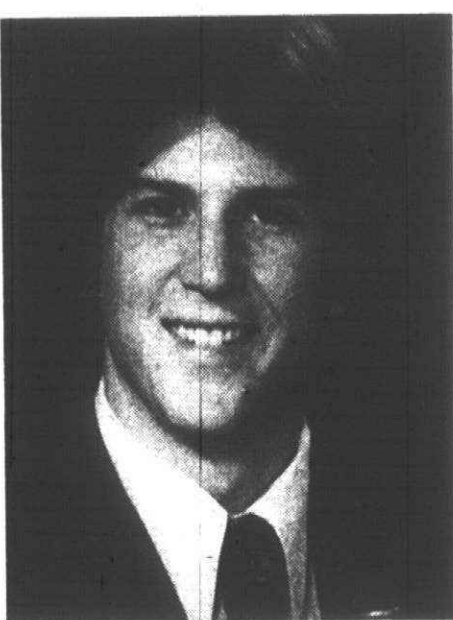
9:30 a.m. in Varner Recital Hall; the program starts at 10 a.m. The fee includes admission to the evening's concert. Concert admission only is payable at the door.

Plymouth to premier choral work by Jones



Bob Jones, the college's resident composer, will hear his "Passion" performed April 20 by the

Schoolcraft Community Choir and the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra.

Robert W. Jones of Schoolcraft College is a composer with a "passion" for his art.

That happens to be the title of his new major work to be premiered with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra April 20.

When Bob Jones isn't writing music, he is teaching music — or he is performing music.

But when is he not composing? Almost never.

TAKE "PASSION." Conceived more than a year ago as a piece for a community chorus, it has been written specifically for the Schoolcraft Community Choir and the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra.

"It has taken a tremendously coordinated effort," Jones said.

"I discussed it with Marilyn Jones (a Schoolcraft colleague but no relation) who directs the choir, and with Wayne Dunlap, then conductor of the Plymouth Symphony.

"Next came funding, which we secured through a grant through Dean Ron Griffith of the college's community services.

"Finally, the writing, with the heavy composing compacted into last August, sandwiched between the close of summer music school and the start of the fall semester.

"IT'S NOT something you can set aside once you're into it. Concentration is a key factor in composing, and you've got to gear your thinking to be able to do it well.

"I've learned my lesson with 'Passion' — no more biggies while school is in session."

Jones' work will be performed at 4 p.m. April 20 in the Plymouth Salem Auditorium, Joy west of Canton Center Road. Dr. Marilyn Jones will be guest conductor.

Other Joneses are involved. Bob's wife, Anne, wrote 10 poems for the work based on its Biblical text. Dave,

Marilyn's husband, did the copying. Christopher, Bob and Anne's 17-year-old son, will be playing string bass in the orchestra.

THE JONES "Passion" is based on the Gospel of St. Matthew from the Last Supper through the burial of Christ in the tomb of Joseph of Aramathia.

It portrays Christ's passion from the viewpoint of the women involved.

Bob Jones joined Schoolcraft as resident composer in 1969. He has produced 30 pieces since then including "Mass in Motion" in 1974; "Pilgrimage," a Bicentennial opera in 1976; and a ballet, "Burning Tree," written with Schoolcraft English instructor Ralph Kelley in 1976 for the Plymouth Symphony.

A faculty recital this summer will consist solely of Jones compositions, including a new violin sonata he is writing.

A NATIVE of Chicago, Jones earned a bachelor's and master's degrees in music at California's University of the Redlands. He also took post-graduate courses at the University of Minnesota where he was a teaching fellow.

But Schoolcraft really has been his only teaching post, he says, and generally he likes the combination of teaching and composing.

With roots in a large city, Bob and

Anne enjoy living in northwest Detroit's Rosedale Park. Their daughter, Gwyneth, 15, like her older brother, attends Waldorf High in Indian Village.

"We weren't sure either of the children would be attracted to music, but they've both gotten interested within the past two years," Jones said. "Gwyn is a violinist, and Christopher, of course, plays string bass."

Wife Anne is also a musician and joined her husband in a recent performance to benefit the college's new grand piano. But she prefers prose writing, according to Jones.

ON THE OTHER hand, Bob has little time for anything other than music. Even his hobby as a model railroader has taken a side track.

Besides composing, teaching and performing, he is organist at the First Presbyterian Church of Plymouth.

What's ahead for Bob Jones? Hopefully, a sabbatical leave for the winter semester in 1981.

"I plan to use the time to clean up some shorter musical works and to complete a music appreciation textbook for community colleges."

"Composition-wise," Jones said, "I've done practically every kind of work there is — jazz, motion picture score, symphonic, ballet, opera."

"I guess the best I can see ahead is perhaps bigger and better versions of each."

New record studio launched

Joseph Rosanova Jr., president of Rosanova Productions Inc., in Southfield, has a tired look about him, even at 9 o'clock in the morning.

If his eyes have a droopy look and he seems a bit weary, he may have a right to be beat. He's been fighting for an idea since 1972. That was the year Joe Rosanova decided to drop out of the music rat race, head back to Detroit and do what he always wanted to do — form his own record company.

Almost anyone can do that, but, his vision was grander. He dreamed of a successful record company in the Detroit area.

As everyone knows, there is only one really successful record company associated with Detroit. A few years back, that company got into motion pictures and hit the road for L.A.

"What Motown did was incredible," Rosanova said, as he leaned over his cluttered desk one morning recently. "That was a success. It stands on its own. Everyone, no matter what color or nationality, was proud of Motown."

"I'D LIKE TO recapture that part of what Motown did for this whole metro area."

He believes there is a definite void in Detroit and the Midwest. "I feel that in Detroit there is more talent and creative people than almost anywhere else. But, they've always had to go to another city to prove themselves. The talent pool is unlimited in Detroit. It's

like finding a gold mine," Rosanova said.

Rosanova Productions Inc. is at 17233 W. 10 Mile Road. The whole idea behind the production company was to mine the ore from that gold mine and market it to entertainment-hungry Detroiters. But like the struggle to find a gold mine, the dream merely existed on a fantasy level without significant progress toward reality.

"We started putting it together in 1972," Rosanova said, as he gave a detailed narrative of a trying and exhausting eight years. "That's when we began the physical work, applying for licenses and getting people involved."

In 1973, the first prospectus was filed with the Security Bureau for the proposed company, a publically held corporation. It was not until May 1977 that the Security Bureau allowed the fledgling company the right to begin selling stock.

ROSANOVA EXPLAINED the reason for the delay: "The Security Bureau had no rule of thumb to go by. There was no company like this ever set up in Michigan. Besides, we were new and had no track record. People in brokerage firms agreed it was a great concept, but we had to convince them we could sell stock."

The Security Bureau gave them one year from May 1977 to sell 100,000 shares. Rosanova said, "Then we had to convince other people we could do what we said we could and be successful."

On the day the year was up, Rosanova Productions Inc., has sold 109,000 shares at a dollar apiece. In January 1980 the company actually became operational.

Long before January of this year, however, work was proceeding behind the scenes. A building was leased, designed and decorated to house a record company's total operations. More importantly, people who could make a record company go were being tapped.

The company was divided into major departments: recording, marketing, promotion, management and distribution. Each division needed a director. Joe Rosanova of Westland and his associates, Johnny Trudell of Detroit, Adrienne, Levine of West Bloomfield, Dr.

Carl Pesta of New Baltimore and Richard Bone of Birmingham were able to secure talented and experienced people for each division leader.

JOE ROSANOVA carries the title and responsibility of president. Music industry veterans Gordon Prince, Jay Butler and Etta St. James have set up national distribution and promotion. Johnny Trudell known locally as one of Detroit's finest trumpet players, is vice president and head of the Recording Division.

"The structure of our company," Rosanova said, "is to encompass every aspect of the entertainment business. Our capital so far, though, has been put in the key areas of recording and production."

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backgammon

HITTING

Backgammon strategies basically consist of running, blocking and hitting. The most intricate is hitting.

Before jumping at every opportunity to hit, you should analyze the entire situation. Keep several considerations in mind:

- How many "closed points" (two checkers on any given point) do you have in your home board compared to your opponent? If you hit, the more closed points you have, the greater the chances your opponent may remain on the bar for a turn or two.

- How many points, if any, and which point does your opponent "own" in your home board? (The same applies to you, vice-versa.)

- Is this a very critical move near the end game or middle game (having a lot of play left)?

- If you hit, how many return shots will your opponent have? (Assuming he can get off the bar with one-half of a roll and hit an exposed checker with the other half.)

- Should you hit your opponent, how many extra builders do you have bearing in on your home board points?

- If you don't hit, what other dangers lie ahead?

THE FOLLOWING board example actually occurred during a backgammon tournament which I was observing. Black on roll has a six-four to play.

Analyze this one carefully before drawing your own conclusion. There appear to be many more options than normal. Hitting white on the 11 point is only one of them.

If black decides to hit white with the four roll, where will he play the six move? His only good six move would be to advance a checker from the 12 point to the bar point (7 point), but that leaves three exposed blots for a very possible return shot (19 out of 36).

IN THE GAME:

After a brief study, black decided

against hitting. There are several six-four moves, but no matter how black moves, he will have at least one exposed checker.

By moving a checker from white's 10 point and 12 point to black's 9 point, black felt he was leaving the least amount of odds to be hit by white on the 12 point (actually 23 out of 36).

White then rolled a four-one, hitting black with the one, and eventually finished him off for a victory.

BEST OVERALL MOVE:

Naturally, it's easy for me to criticize black's decision against hitting because I was not in his position. But a closer look at the board shows several interesting things.

If black were to hit, white had only 19 out of 36 ways to re-enter and get a return shot. (He rolled four-one). Even if white did not stay on the bar, there were 17 out of 36 ways that, after re-entering, he may have missed hitting black altogether.

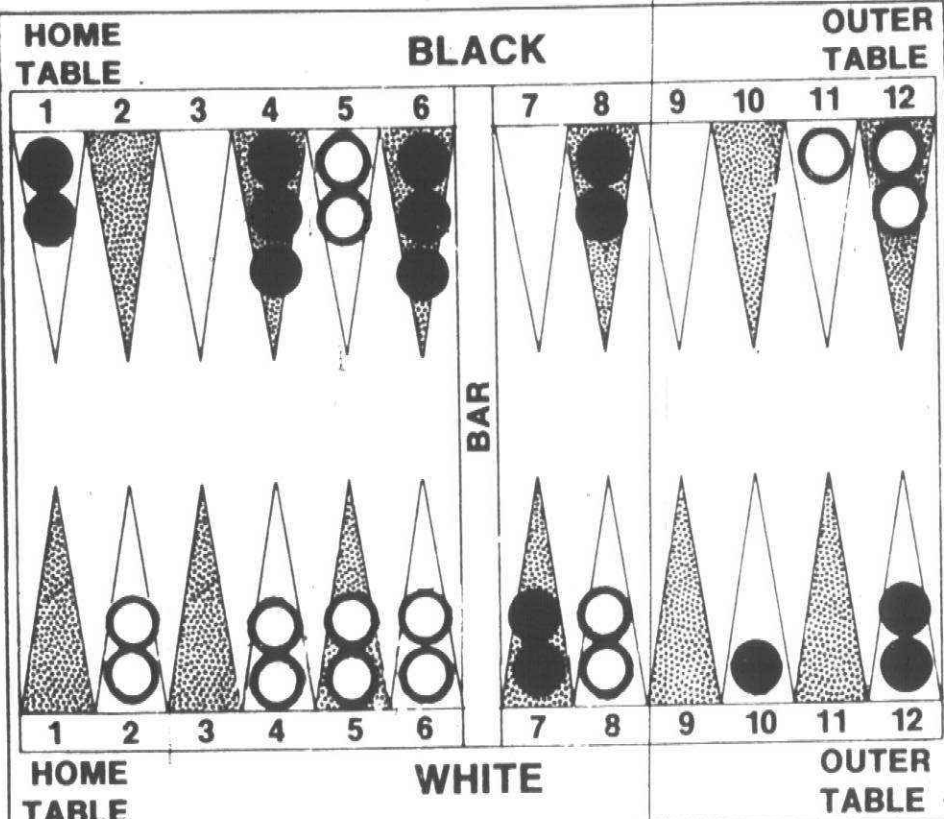
If black had hit white on the 11 point with the four roll, the move for the six roll could have been black's checker on the 12 point to the bar point. This checker, along with the extra builders on the 6 and 4 point, would have been useful to close more home board points on his next roll.

What if black left three blots and white were to hit one? Black would have the 1 and 3 points to re-enter. White had not extra builders anywhere near his home board, which, without builders, you cannot attack or make closed points.

Black owned white's bar point (7 point). White would be forced, sooner or later, having seven checkers to clear the bar point, to leave a shot.

I believe black could have played a much stronger game by hitting white.

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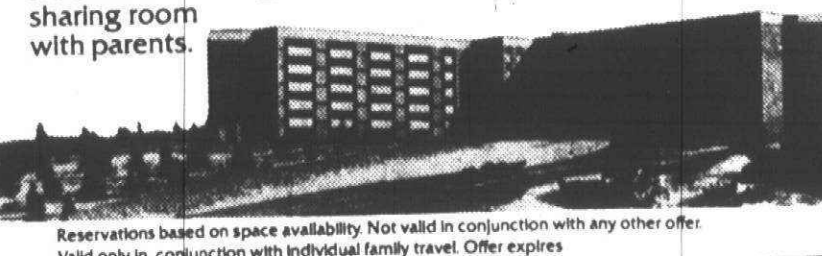
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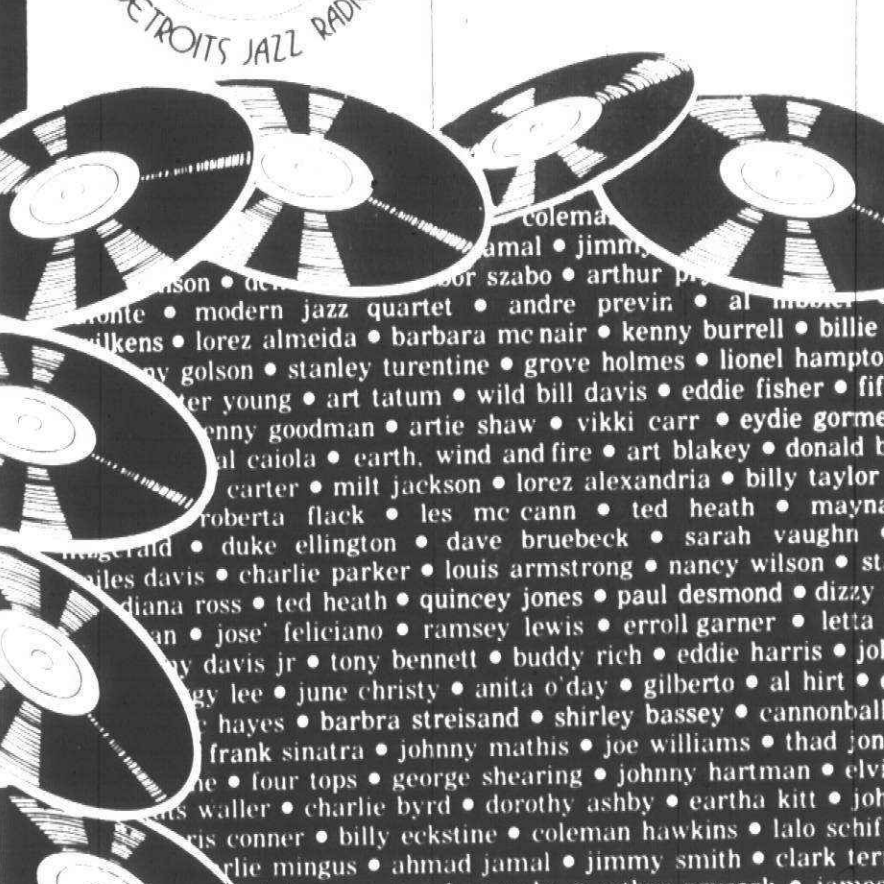
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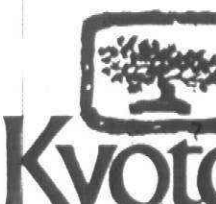

Author 'stumbled' into writing

Seymour Epstein didn't expect to become a writer. And, given the state of the art today, neither should anyone else, he maintains.

"I stumbled into my life," says the writer-in-residence at the University of Michigan, implying as an after-thought that at least he was moving in the right direction.

"It's not as if it fell into my lap. I worked very hard for it."

Unfortunately, even precise proportions of luck and hard work may not spell success in today's writing market, according to Epstein. Publishers, he says, no longer regard fiction as a lucrative investment and the public is reading less, anyway.

Epstein is the author of "Love Affair," "Looking For Fred Schmidt," "The Dream Museum," "Caught In

That Music," "Leah," "Pillar of Salt" and short stories.

NOVELS, HE says, are either so sensationalistic or esoteric that they fail to capture a broad audience, which is either resorting or choosing to watch more and more television.

To complete a vicious circle, "Television has become so atrocious that the nightmare for many Americans is finding themselves at 7:30 in the evening with nothing to do but read a book."

"There used to be the feeling that knowledge could somehow make a difference in one's life. Most people now are convinced that nothing is going to make a difference; if they approach a novel with that leaden certainty, why read it?"

Yet, ironically, ever greater numbers of people want to be writers to

compensate for the absence of values that used to be willed them by society, Epstein says.

"Surely they (aspiring writers) must know the chances of their being successful are minuscule, but it doesn't seem in any way to quench the source of their enthusiasm."

THE SURGE of interest in writing "has to do with the fact that the center of existence is not holding together — there is no moral center, yet the desire to mark one's existence in the world hasn't diminished... it's as if people are saying that if they can't be part of a meaningful commemoration, they'll have to create their own."

Such impromptu soul-searching, Epstein concludes, leads to the production of writing that is more therapeutic

than artful.

"Our constantly reaching out for a new way of saying things is a way to guarantee quick obsolescence."

Fiction — like myth, its most durable form — needs a bedrock of beliefs to survive, he says: "Myth has always been important in civilization; in order to have a myth root, something had to remain around for 100 years, but the rate of culture now turns so fast, that there is no longer anything solid enough to nurture myth."

Epstein says he has deliberately insulated part of himself from what he senses as people's current desperation; he's written a book ("From the Sidelines") about a housewife-turned-writer who suffers the dilemma of people impinging on her life for answers which she cannot give.
