

# Agency looks at ways to decrease auto dependence

A regional transportation authority is formulating plans that could decrease the dependence of Canton commuters on the automobile.

The plans under study include the expansion of bus service to downtown Detroit and the establishment of a commuter rail stop in or near Canton Township.

Gail Whitty, local government relations director for the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA), said the agency is considering a rail stop at either Lilley Road in southern Canton or at Belleville Road in Van Buren Township.

The stop would comply with a SEMTA goal to implement commuter rail service between downtown Detroit and Ann Arbor by 1983. SEMTA plans to open additional rail stops between the two cities by the time the commuter service is implemented, Ms. Whitty said.

SEMTA's plan calls for six commuter train runs a day in 1983, 10 in 1985 and 22 in 1987.

OTHER PLANS include the expansion of bus service from Canton to downtown Detroit, possibly by next September.

Chuck Switzer, scheduling director for SEMTA's Wayne County division, said the agency is considering establishment of two additional bus lines with stops on Joy and Cherry Hill roads in Canton.

The bus service would be offered during morning and afternoon rush hours.

Plans for the future could also include establishment of a local bus line between Canton, Plymouth and Northville, Switzer said.

A park-and-ride program from Meijer Thrifty Acres to downtown Detroit is the only service currently offered by SEMTA in Canton Township. Ms. Whitty said SEMTA is looking at alternative routes for that line to decrease driving time from Canton to Detroit.

The buses, which run during rush hour only, currently take more than an hour to reach their destinations. Ms. Whitty cautioned, however, that "nothing is definite yet."

She said SEMTA will begin a preliminary engineering study soon to determine which of two sites is the best for a commuter rail stop. Switzer expects a decision on bus service expansion within the next few months.

THE TWO visited Canton Township officials along with other SEMTA representatives last week to present their tentative plans for mass transit.

Canton Supervisor Noel Culbert urged SEMTA last December to consider a commuter rail stop in the township and expansion of bus services.

Ms. Whitty said chances are good that SEMTA will establish the rail stop in the vicinity of Canton.

Commuter rail service between Detroit and Ann Arbor is part of SEMTA's regional transportation plan, she said. The plan also includes doubling of bus service in the metropolitan area.

According to Ms. Whitty, SEMTA will take over responsibility for Detroit-to-Ann Arbor rail service in 1983. The line is currently operated by Amtrak as part of the company's Detroit-to-Chicago run.

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### Garbage collector finds man in truck

Fred Mullins had an unpleasant surprise when he woke up Tuesday morning.

He was inside a garbage truck.

Richard Williams, the driver of the garbage truck, was about to dump his load at the Woodland Meadows landfill in southeast Canton about 8:20 a.m. Tuesday when he heard screams coming from the back of his truck.

Williams called Canton Township firefighters, who rescued the 66-year-old Detroit. He had been inside the truck for over 5 hours, according to police.

The truck was the property of Waste Management Co. of Canton. Mullins told police that he had no idea how he got in the truck in the first place. Mullins suggested that either he fell in a dumpster or someone put him there.

Police suspect that Mullins was intoxicated and climbed into the dumpster to fall asleep.

Mullins was found in the very front of the truck. Police theorized that Mullins was picked up from a dumpster at Grand River and Clifford in Detroit. It was one of the first stops for Williams that day.

Mullins was lucky to wake up when he did. According to Lt. Larry Stewart of the Canton Police, Mullins could have been killed if he had been dumped at the landfill area.

As it turned out though, Mullins was relatively unscathed when he emerged from the truck.

"He had a bad ride," said Stewart. "I don't think he wants to see us again."

Mullins was taken to Detroit where three warrants for failure to appear at Detroit's Traffic Court await him.

Incidentally, he was taken in a car.

## Auto thieves like Canton

In 1979, 161 automobiles were reported stolen in Canton Township.

This year looks to be just as profitable for the car thieves, considering that 33 cars have been reported stolen thus far this year in the township.

Unbelievable? Even the police seem to think so.

"It's amazing that a township the size of Canton would lose a car every other day," said Lt. Larry Stewart of the Canton Police Department.

What happens to these cars after they're reported stolen? Sometimes they're returned. Often they are found completely burned and destroyed.

Thirty autos were recovered "torched" last year. Police speculate that there might be more at stake than just simple auto theft.

They have already uncovered several fraud cases where a person paid to have someone "steal" their car.

Why do people pay to have their own car stolen?

"There's a lot of money to be made," said Stewart. "People try to get out of their debts."

THE PROCESS is relatively simple. The car is "stolen" and driven to some

unpopulated road. There the car is parked and burned. The theft is reported to the police, and the "victim" is paid by the insurance company.

Most auto owners, however, do not pay to have their car stolen. But car thieves have become so sophisticated, there is virtually no car that they cannot steal. In Garden City, thieves simply towed away a car once, Stewart recalled from his tenure there.

Auto theft is popular, because the parts of a car are generally worth more than the car itself.

"You can get \$500 for one motor," says Stewart.

The police cannot offer much comfort to Canton's residents.

"If somebody wants your car, they're going to get it," says Stewart. "Just don't make it easier for people to steal."

There are a few precautions that an auto owner can take, such as auto alarms or a lock that goes from the brake pedal to the steering wheel.

One of the more effective methods of preventing car thefts, suggests Stewart, is a hidden kill switch that turns the ignition off completely. One of these switches can be installed for as little as

\$20. A car with one of these switches cannot be started until the switch is on.

On the weekend of May 20, two police officers from Canton Township will be among those attending the National Auto Theft Investigators Conference in Toronto. There will be information pertaining to the theft of all vehicles from motorcycles to boats to automobiles.

Lt. Stewart hopes that the Canton Police Department will learn new techniques for the prevention of auto theft.

## Wanted: Your cable TV ideas

You don't have to be an expert to sit on a cable TV committee.

Omnicom — the firm contracted by Canton to provide cable services — is seeking residents who will act as a liaison between subscribers and the company.

Persons interested in a committee appointment are asked to contact the supervisor's or clerk's office at Canton Township hall, 397-1000.

John Raines, president of Omnicom, hopes committee members will represent a broad cross section of Canton's

population. He envisions a committee of five to seven members.

Specific charges for the committee have not been formulated. But Raines hopes that the group will give advice on the type of local origination programs which Canton viewers want.

The township's cable system will not be activated until next fall or winter, according to Raines. He said the committee should be formed soon to familiarize members with the capabilities of cable television.

Raines expects to begin laying cables in Canton next summer.

Construction of the system has already begun in neighboring Plymouth and Plymouth Township, which awarded contracts to Omnicom months before Canton took similar steps.

According to Raines, approximately 40 miles of "strands" have been laid in the Plymouth communities. The strands support the actual cable, which transmits signals from a receiving station to subscribers' homes. Raines expects to activate the system in Plymouth and Plymouth Township next summer.

### Board weighs 2nd bond try

A request for voters to approve a loan of \$11 million may be on the June 9 ballot of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

An \$11 million bond issue was recommended to the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education Monday night by Superintendent John Hoben. If voters approved the loan for \$11 million, the debt retirement levy the first year would be 1.12 mills higher or an increase in added taxes of \$45 a year for the owner of an \$80,000 home.

Hoben also recommended a second ballot issue which, if approved by voters, would allow the school district to levy its present authorized rate of 35.26 mills (\$35.26 per \$1,000 state equalized evaluation).

The second proposal, in effect, would undo the Headlee rollback which would have forced the authorized millage to a lower level of 33.94 mills — a reduction of 1.32 mills.

The school board will discuss the two ballot proposals recommended by administration at a work study meeting this Monday at 7:30 p.m. in the board offices at 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth. A final decision must be made by the April 28 school board meeting if deadlines are to be met to place the issues on the June 9 ballot.

HOBEN STRESSED that the administration believes the district still needs the \$14.7 million loan requested in Proposition I of last month's special election.

However, state law provides "substantial" change must be made in a ballot proposal before it can be brought back to voters within six months of a defeat, explained Hoben.

With other elections scheduled, the school board would be unable to bring back the same proposal until the week of Sept. 28 or sometime in January 1981.

With inflation of 1 percent a month, Hoben said, the board would have to request a \$16.6 million bond issue in September to buy what the \$14.7 million bond issue of March 1980 would have purchased.

Rather than raising the cost of Proposition I by almost \$2 million, Hoben said, it would be better to cut out necessary parts and give voters a chance to approve an \$11 million issue in June.

School bonding attorneys have indicated that an \$11 million request would be considered substantially different and would meet the law's requirements.

About \$500,000 to buy new buses and about one half (\$3 million) of planned renovations of Central Middle School were deleted from the \$14.7 million proposal defeated in March to reach the \$11 million mark.

The buses may be purchased with operating funds, said Hoben, although the needed renovation of Central will have to be delayed until sometime in the future when voters are more likely to approve it.

THE SECOND BALLOT proposal requested by Hoben would read:

"Shall the authorized millage rate for operating purposes of Plymouth-

Canton Community Schools, Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, Michigan, be approved for levy in 1980 without regard to reduction required by Section 31 of Article 9 of the State Constitution of 1963?"

Hoben said this proposal is an attempt to recover a \$1.1 million 1980-81 operating budget caused by the millage rollback required by the tax limitation provisions of the constitution.

By voting, in effect, to restore the 1.32 mills otherwise cut back, the district would keep the \$1.1 million in income without any increase in millage being levied.

"The proposal is something like a millage renewal in that there is no increase in rate being levied on the taxpayer. All we would be asking for is permission to levy all authorized mills — the mills we collected for 1979-80."

Hoben said he felt it would be better to seek restoration of the 1.32 mills otherwise lost, than to ask voter approval of additional millage.

The district next year is facing a reduction in state aid payments of about \$1.5 million in addition to the \$1.1 million loss because of the Headlee rollback.

The current budget figures indicate a budget deficit of about \$2 million for the coming year which must be made up somehow. Hoben said if the 1.32 mills were restored by voters the budget would be balanced with about \$500,000 from this year's fund equity and by cutting about \$500,000 from current expenses.

THE ADMINISTRATION also is asking the school board to go on record affirming that:

• There will be no need for Expanded School Year (ESY) expansion in 1980-81 but likely will be at the elementary level the following year.

• There will be no need for boundary changes in '80-81 but there will be readjustments of overflow of student population at the elementary and middle school levels.

• There will be a realignment of grades after the '80-81 school year.

It's about this time of year that the farm's various livestock give birth to their youngsters.

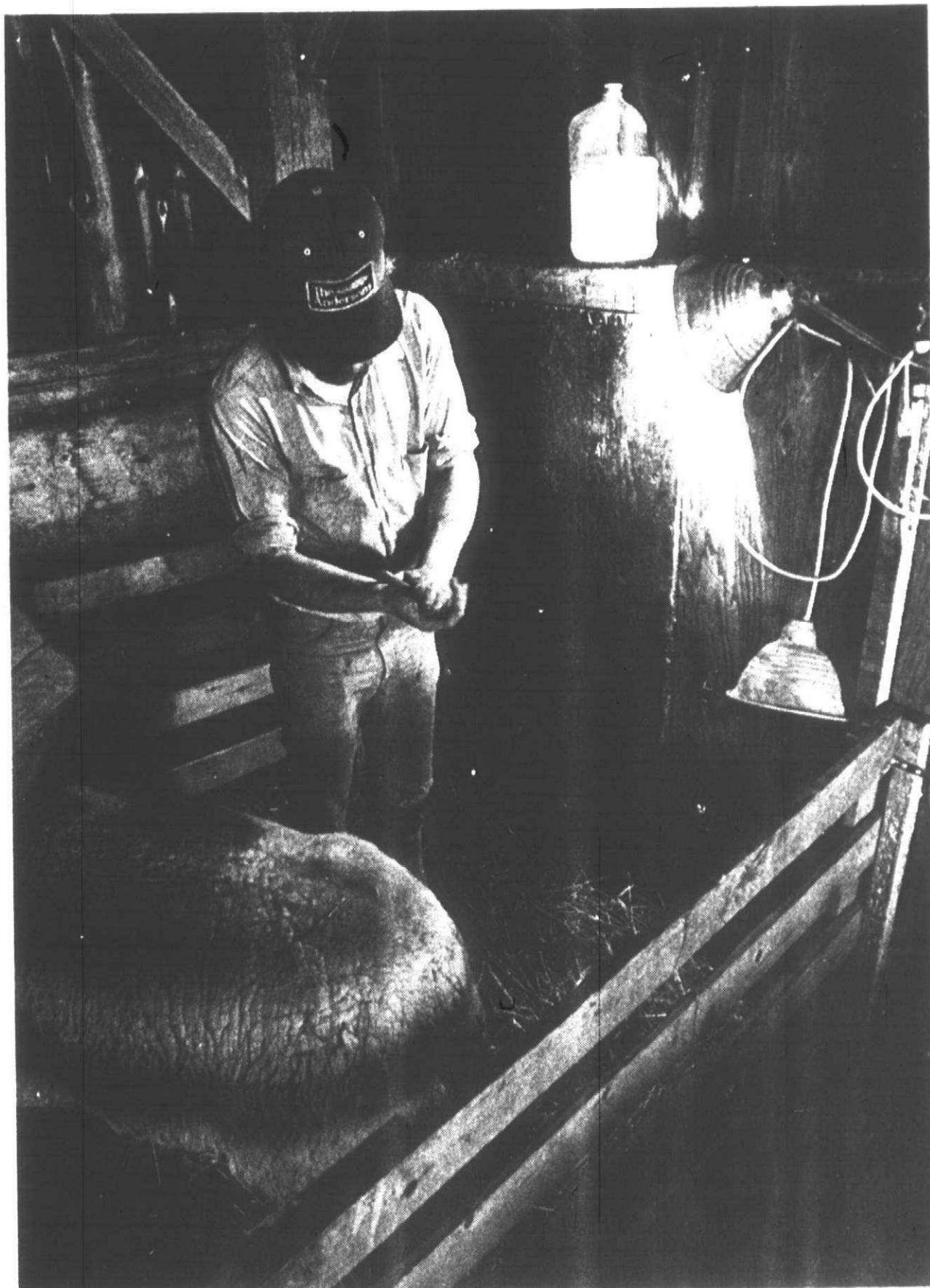
Last weekend nine Suffolk lambs were born, five within a 24-hour-period.

During the week school trips are arranged

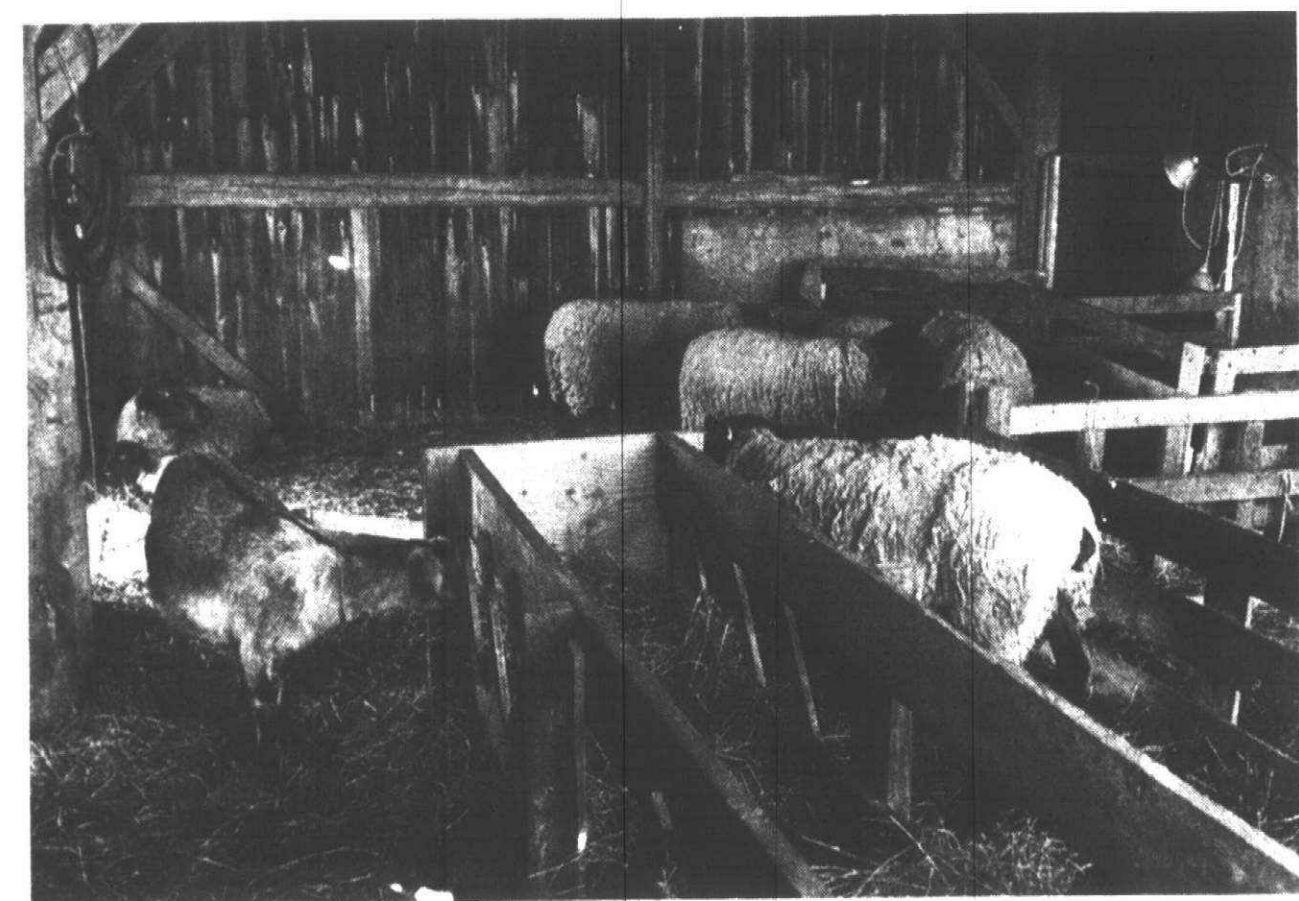
for elementary and preschool children.

The Smith's pet dog also was on hand to await the arrival of the newborns.

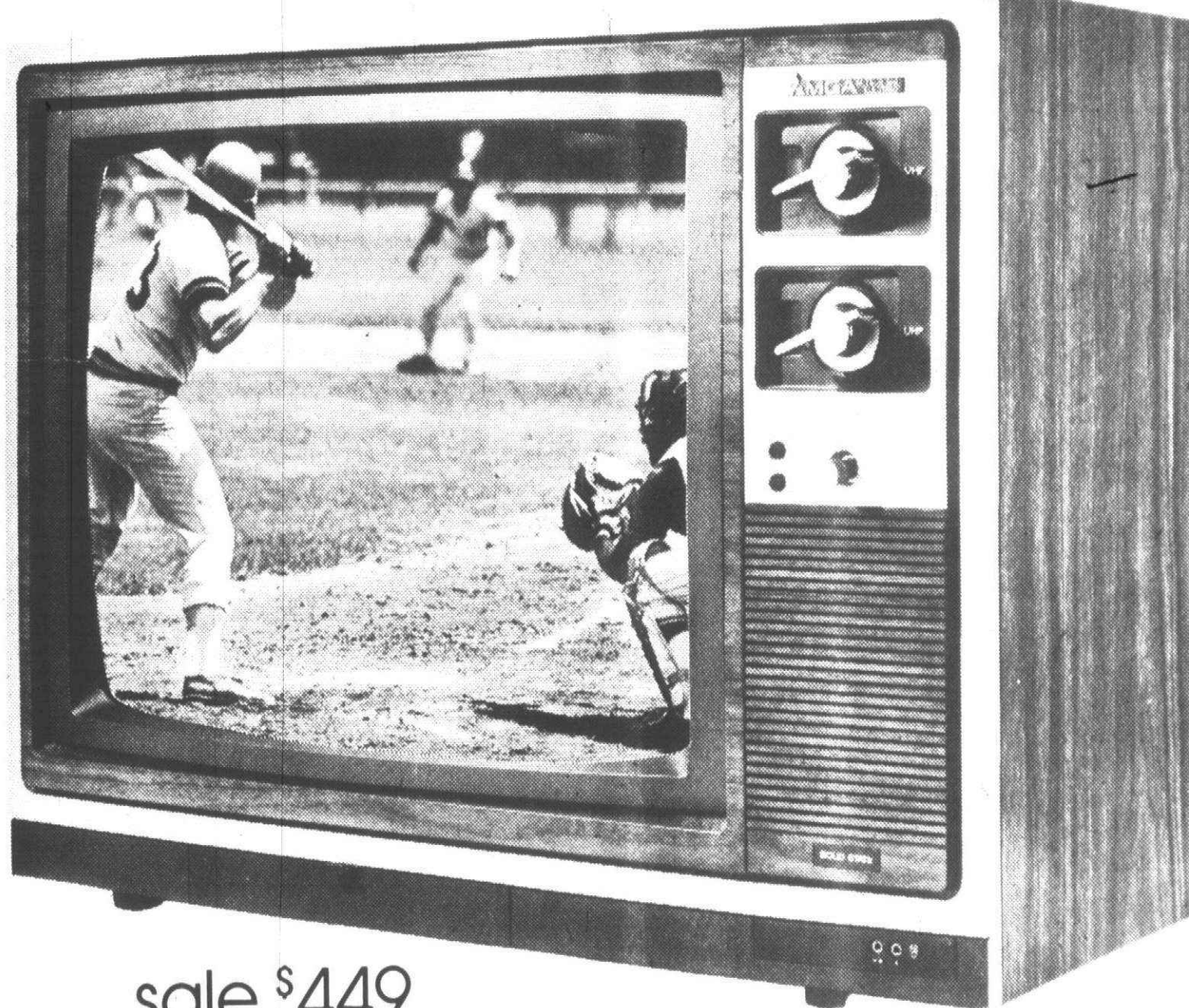


Sheep, goats and young calves can be viewed at the CEP animal farm on the high school complex.

• Pioneer Middle will switch from ESY to the traditional nine-month calendar in '81-82. The money saved from the five staff positions not needed will then be used to help equip Lowell Junior High.

Hoben also is asking the board to confirm its plans to rent Lowell for grades 7-9 in school year 1981-82, to use portables beginning in '81-82, and to make major boundary changes in school year '81-82.

Trustee Elaine Kirchgatter said she strongly supported the proposal to restore 132 operating mills but favored delaying making a bond request until September.

Trustees Sylvia Stetz and Tom Yack both indicated they supported both ballot requests from administration. The three trustees made their positions known Monday because they will be absent from this Monday's study session.

The \$11 million bond proposal would

buy portable buildings, pay for the energy management system, improve Central Middle by about \$3 million, add air conditioning to buildings to be used for year-round school, and remodel existing buildings.

The \$11 million issue, if approved, will place high priority on projects involving roof maintenance, boilers and energy saving, meeting code requirements, health and safety issues, expansion of ESY, and involving grade realignment.

The \$11 million project will assign low priority to replacement of furniture and equipment, replacement of ceilings, flooring, interior refurbishing, site improvements and redecorating.

The \$3 million work to be done on Central includes replacing a damaged portion of the roof, adding an elevator, replacing the mechanical and electrical systems to meet code, provide barrier free renovations, and restore or replace the plumbing system to meet code requirements.

# Sex education class gets OK

A new reproductive health curricula and materials for the instruction were approved Monday night by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education. The instruction will be offered as part of the health education class taken by all ninth graders at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

The material to be used was approved 7-0 after being reviewed individually by each school trustee.

Among the subject matter covered in reproductive health is an introduction to methods of contraceptive and a discussion of medical reasons why women may have an abortion.

The instruction is required by a state law (Public Act 226 of 1977) and meets the requirements of that law because

abortion is not presented as an acceptable method of birth control.

The information being added to the health education course will supplement the sixth grade and eighth grade sex education classes and the family living courses taken by 11th graders.

All ninth graders will take the instruction unless their parents request that their children be excused. Arrangements will be made for parents who wish to review the charts and filmstrips which will be used in the classes, said Dr. Michael Homes, assistant superintendent of instruction.

Dr. E.J. McClendon, a member of the advisory committee recommending the material, said the instruction might be offered at the lower grades later on but

the ninth grade was a good place to start with mandatory instruction.

Trustee Carol Davis said she was impressed with the film strip which presented a discussion on values and human sexuality.

McClendon told the board that all ninth grade health education instructors have received special instruction from the state and are certified as being qualified to offer reproductive health instruction.

There also was a discussion about offering the material to adults through the community education department so that parents could take the instruction as the same time their parents do. This was done in Flint, said McClendon, and the demand was such that the num-

ber of classes offered had to be increased by six times.

The advisory committee was chaired by Shirley Cunningham, school nurse for the district. Clergymen on the committee were Rev. Ted Taylor, Fr. Kenneth McKenna and Dr. Fred Prezioso.

Parents on the committee were Janet Brass and Karen Willard with student representatives being Victoria Svec and Amy Kemegis.

Educators on the committee included Ken Jacobs, Janet Lawson, Carol Johnston, Dr. McClendon, John Sandmann, Allie Suffety, Sandra Franck, Denise Gimpel and Dr. John Telford.

Other members were John Vandenberg, Dr. Paul Schubert and Betty Barber.

# Hoben gets new contract

A new contract was approved Monday by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education for the superintendent of schools.

The new contract is for the current school and is almost a year late in being signed.

The agreement provides for a pay raise of 6.6 percent, from \$46,922 to \$50,000, and other improvements in fringe benefits.

The fringe benefits include a maximum mileage allowance of \$1,800 a year, a maximum expense allowance of \$3,000 a year, a tax shelter annuity of 5 percent of base salary, and the usual improvements in life, health and disability insurance coverage given other

district employees.

Tom Yack, board president, said there was some discussion among trustees about not extending a contract to the superintendent until the board had signed agreements with all employee groups.

Yack said the board decided against that approach, though, as the employees also have some control over the outcome of negotiations and it is not entirely up to the administration on whether a settlement is reached.

Hoben has been superintendent of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools for 10 years which makes him the most senior superintendent in Wayne County.

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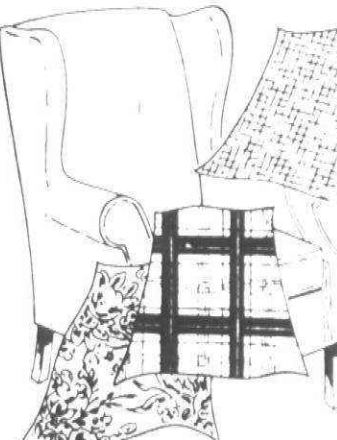
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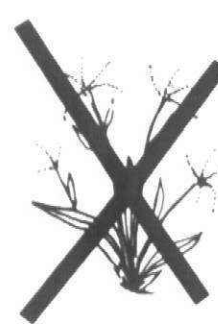
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Friend of the Court:

Does service take a back seat to collections?

Second in a series.

"The Friend of the Court does not have the caliber of people to handle the trauma and the emotional problems that occur. You have heard it said that divorce is worse than death, because death is final. If you have children, you are never divorced."

— Testimony to the Michigan Women's Commission

"You go in, sign your name and sit around and wait. It's kind of like unemployment, except you pay them money and you get to sit down."

Michigan's Friend of the Court system, which oversees all divorces involving minors, nationally is considered one of the best in the nation for its high rate of collecting child support.

"In most states, there is no agency comparable to the Friend of the Court for cases in which the custodial parent is not receiving welfare," according to David Chambers, University of Michigan law professor, in his five-year study of the system, "Making Fathers Pay."

But despite its collections' record, critics argue that the county agencies are not equipped to handle the problems of divorcing parents and their children.

Alan Lebow of Equal Rights for Fathers, a Southfield-based group, organized by divorced fathers, sees Friend of the Court itself as a cause of problems. He argues that the agency's inefficiency causes numerous visits to the office and actually increases the workload.

"They never come to a decision," said Lebow, who estimates he's been to court 50 times in the five years since his divorce.

"They never take care of those cases to begin with and then complain about staffing. Why do you have to go to court anyway? Because the lawyers make money. Divorced people are fed up with the government, judges and lawyers."

ONE DIVORCED woman wrote a letter to the Wayne County Friend of the Court because her former husband owed her about \$700 in child support. Within one week, a court date had been scheduled for her ex-husband. But the Friend of the Court's records held her ex-husband in arrears for about \$1,000 more than he owed her, she said.

He met with the Friend of the Court seven times to attempt to clear up the record. Finally she appeared in court with her husband as he tried to explain that he didn't owe the \$1,000.

"The judge was so rude to him. She told him, 'You just shut up. You speak when you're asked to.'"

"She wouldn't settle anything. We went over to Friend of the Court but they wouldn't see us. We had to make an appointment. So we went back again and they put him on probation for one year. I had no idea how they ever came up with so much money so I had to sign an affidavit that he wasn't in arrears for the extra \$1,000 they had tacked on there."

"I wondered if I said, 'Yeh, he owes me that money.' I wonder if they would have made them pay it. Because some women are so bitter, they'd do anything to take him to the cleaners."

CRITICISMS of Friend of the Court voiced during hearings conducted last year by the Michigan Women's Commission included open hostility, negativity, sexist attitudes and "not caring."

Mothers said they were made to feel guilty because they're divorced. Attorneys said sexist attitudes pervade investigations, such as not requiring verification of both parents' earnings.

Fathers also are concerned about the lack of uniformity among counties. Currently, there is no state agency that oversees the county agencies. Crossing the county line can mean as much as \$20 more per week for child support. Each county sets its own standards, as well as its own schedule of child support.

In Oakland County, the schedule is "loosely interpreted" by circuit court judges who decide the final settlement, often a compromise. In Wayne County, Friend of the Court only uses a child support schedule for the temporary court order before the final divorce.

In Washtenaw County, a complicated formula of child support is rarely disregarded by judges.

Critics of Friend of the Court also question the qualifications of the staff.

"People are threatened, lied to, ignored," Lebow said. "My experience with Friend of the Court has shown me that I have no reason to have faith or trust in the legal system."

According to reports submitted last year by the Friends of the Court to the Michigan Women's Commission, the number of employees with a background in human services is scant.

In Wayne County, only one of 39 attorneys in Friend of the Court had a degree in a human service field. Statistics on investigators/caseworkers are difficult to categorize, because the agency did not list a total number. But of at least 64 staffers, only five had a master's degree, while none had a master's degree in social work. Of more than 300 employees, Wayne County did not list one psychologist.

The staff of Oakland County's Friend of the Court totaled 89, including 13 attorneys, four with teaching certificates and one who majored in social problems; two investigators/caseworkers with a master's degree; and two psychologists with master's degrees in counseling and guidance.

Both Friends of the Court in Wayne and Oakland counties, appointed by Gov. Milliken, are attorneys.

In Wayne County, referees — all attorneys — are used extensively to hear cases in hopes they can be resolved without going to Circuit Court. All four were promoted from within the department, as was Clayton Christenson, who's been acting Friend of the Court since last year and is awaiting confirmation of his appointment from the governor's office. Christenson's logged more than 40 years with the agency, including stints as a referee and assistant to the Friend of the Court.

Oakland County Friend of the Court John Houghten was appointed to his position in 1976 after spending more than 40 years with the Ferndale School District in an administrative position.

BOTH CHRISTENSON and Houghten said their offices are understaffed and not equipped to deal with the increasing caseload. Oakland County's caseload is only one-sixth of Wayne's, but the rate of new cases added each year is more than half of Wayne's, according to statistics submitted to the Friend of the Court Association.

There are 44 vacancies on Wayne County's staff because of the county's hiring freeze, Christenson said.

Long waits are frequent. Although clients are encouraged to write letters to make a complaint, usually an appointment with an investigator is necessary if there is any kind of dispute. The exception is arrears on child support.

In Oakland County, you may wait as long as 15 minutes on the line to make an appointment.

Because the department logged 87,000 phone calls in 1977, Oakland County began using a tape system that asks the caller to submit a complaint in writing for prompt attention or wait on the line for some other matter.

The system cut the phone calls in half, said Houghten; but he admitted that he's still trying to do better.

Fathers sometimes cause their own problems by not identifying their payment with the case number, said both Houghten and Christenson.

If the name is common, the payment may not end up in the correct file. If the payment cannot be identified, the money escheats to the state. Neither Christenson nor Houghten had any statistics on how much money cannot be credited to the correct account.

Oakland County sends coupons to submit with payments, a practice that appears to resolve most cashier problems, Houghten said.

"But the father is responsible whether he gets the coupon or not," he added.

Wayne County does not have a coupon system; Christenson isn't convinced the expense of supplying coupons is warranted by the problem.

Fathers also are warned to keep strict records of payments. And there is no statute of limitations on back child support.

The court will accept the Friend of the Court's record of payment unless the payer proves the Court is in error, such as in a ledger entry or a payment credited to the wrong account.

The above schedule shows the amount weekly child support a non-custodial parent would pay under guidelines recommended by the Friend of the Court in each of four counties. In Wayne, the schedule is used for the interim order between filing for divorce and final judgment. It may be followed in the final decree. Oakland and Livingston counties use a schedule of 20 percent of net pay for one child, although the schedule is considered flexible. In Washtenaw, the schedule is a complicated formula that also allows for a 10 percent rebate if the custodial parent's income equals the non-custodial parent's income. It is usually followed by judges.

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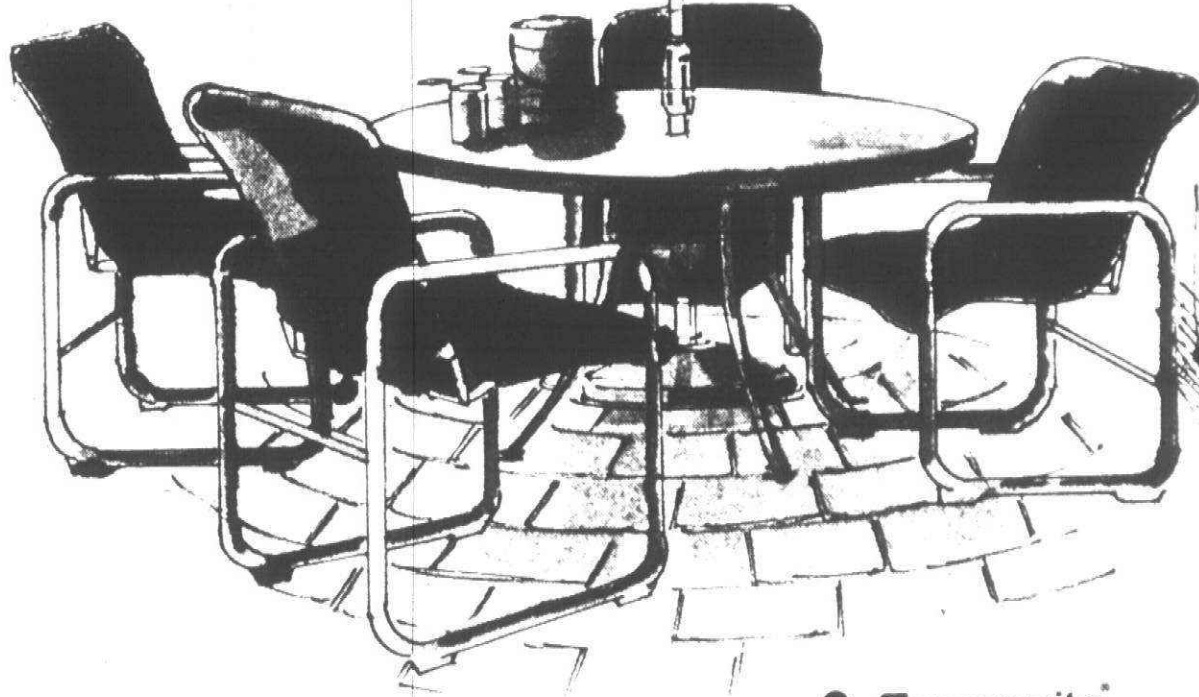
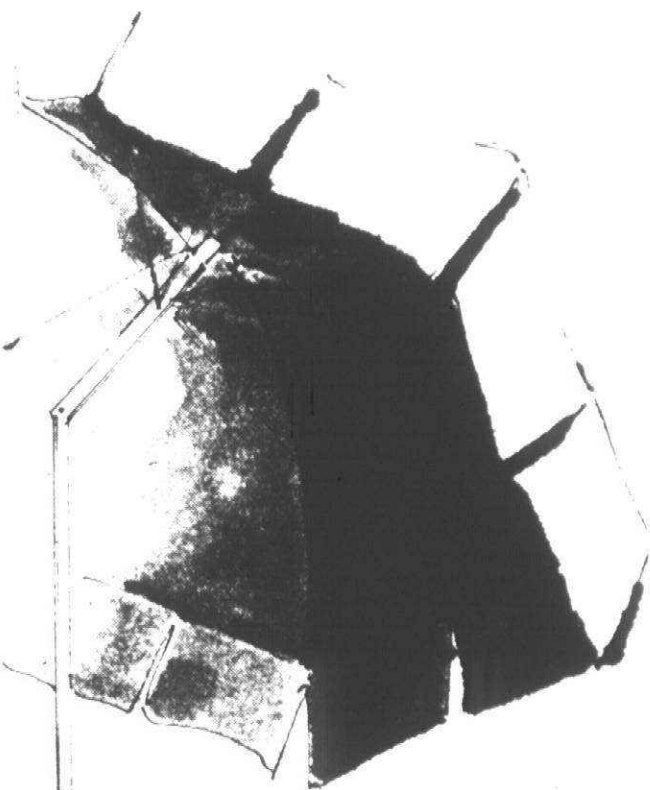


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# Residents want to keep the township 'quiet'

The majority of Plymouth Township residents who recently settled here did so because they liked the "quiet suburban" atmosphere.

And they'd like to keep it that way. Those were the findings in a survey of some 837 township residents last February.

The survey, conducted by Service Organization Consultants Inc. (SOC), also found:

Almost 70 percent of the respondents had lived in another Michigan community before moving to Plymouth Township.

And 44 percent of the survey respondents have lived in the township for only five years.

Among reasons for moving here were: the quiet environment; reasonable taxes; good school system; close to freeways and work places; and high property values.

In the sample findings, only one-third said they had lived here for more than 10 years. And less than 20 percent said

they have lived here for less than three years.

The biggest population increase was found in the township's western end. Fifty percent of these respondents (431) were questioned from this section) said they had moved here in the past five years.

The LakePointe area appeared to house more established residents. Of the 153 questioned, 47 percent said they have lived in Plymouth Township for more than 10 years.

In the southeastern end of the township, 50 percent of the respondents said they have lived here between 3-10 years.

The survey also questioned residents about employment.

Overall, some 20 percent of the respondents said they were unemployed.

The response rate was lower in the western end where 84 percent of the respondents said they were working. In LakePointe 80 percent said they were

employed and in the southeast a one-fourth of the respondents said they were unemployed.

Turning to education, only 7 percent of the respondents said they had not completed high school and most, some 67 percent, reported some college experience.

The survey also found that almost two out of three respondents reported an annual family income of at least \$30,000. Differences were found in the three distinct township areas with the western end once again displayed as more affluent than other regions.

Some 70 percent of the respondents in the west reported this minimum income while 62 percent in LakePointe fell into this income category and only 42 percent in the southeastern end reported it.

An overwhelming majority — 98 percent — of the respondents reported to be white with only two percent registering as black or other nationalities or races.

## How the community opinions were collected

You may be wondering why you received a survey in the mail last February that asked you to respond to queries concerning Plymouth Township's present and future level of services.

Most certainly, you were not alone.

In fact, you were among 1,699 others who were selected in a random selection of names from the township's voter registration list.

That method, surveyors say, is a typical means of reaching potential respondents.

The survey firm, Service Organization Consultants (SOC) Inc., determined even before the forms were mailed that their work would be 95 percent accurate if about 1,700 questionnaires were mailed.

And if 600 questionnaires were returned, they determined that accuracy rate would hold true.

But Plymouth Township residents surprised SOC by returning their questionnaires in record numbers. Of 969 questionnaires returned, 837 were used to tabulate the results.

The 49 percent return rate, they concluded, means that "Plymouth Township residents take more than an average interest in their community development. This also reflects the fact that they are in general better educated and have higher incomes than most communities in the Detroit metropolitan area."

ACCORDING TO the surveyors, the expected response in such mailed surveys is between 20-40 percent.

The random selection of potential respondents was done in four parts. It was previously decided that there are four distinct sections of Plymouth Township and the number of random selections in each was determined by population percentages.

The community was divided into its western end, the Lake Pointe region, the southeastern region and the central part. Among those four areas, greatest response was found in the township's western end.

Surveyors concluded that this trend may indicate that these residents have "a higher degree of civic consciousness."

About 780 surveys were sent to residents of the western end, and about 55

percent of them responded.

In Lake Pointe, 293 surveys were sent and 52 percent were returned.

The southeast section received 564 surveys and the central area received 62 surveys. In determining the returns, results from both regions were combined reaching a 40 percent response rate.

Researcher Rosemarie Moras said Plymouth Township's response rate was higher than anticipated by researchers.

"It was most impressive. People are very interested in their government and that surprises me."

The survey itself included two parts. It attempted to gauge residents' reac-

tions to their present municipal services as well as their opinions of the township's future development.

Questions were determined after testing on two separate "focus groups," informal gatherings of about 12 residents.

"It just amazed us because this is very complicated information and it seemed that people understood it quite well," she added.

While the surveys were sent to single-family homes as well as townhouse, condominium and apartment dwellers, she said they found the greatest response was from single-family homeowners.

One problem in conducting the sur-

vey, she admitted, was found in determining who was the "head of the household," however.

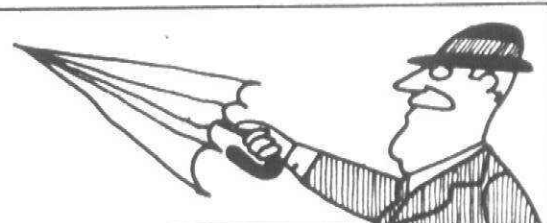
The questionnaires asked that the forms be filled-out by this group of people. No household received more than one form.

"We wanted the answers to relate to the whole household rather than one individual (viewpoint)."

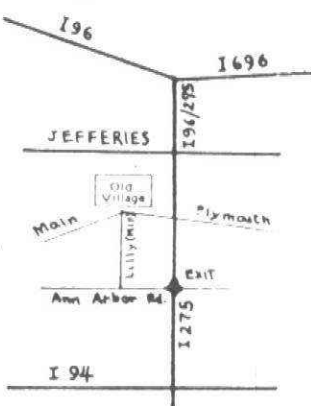
Almost 90 percent of the respondents were married and more than 50 percent of the respondents had an annual gross family income of at least \$30,000.

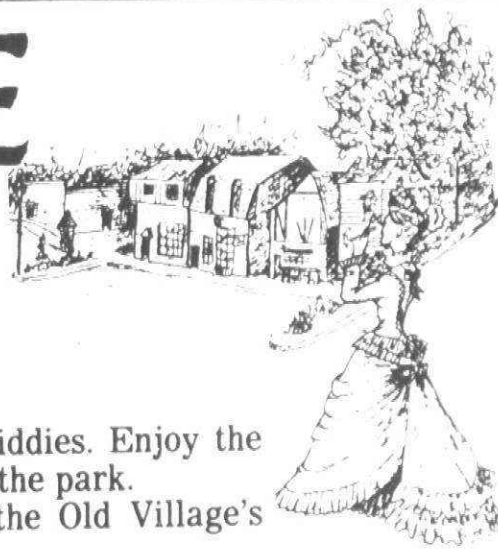

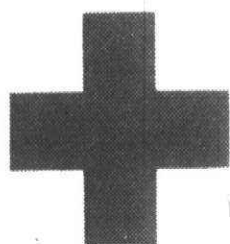

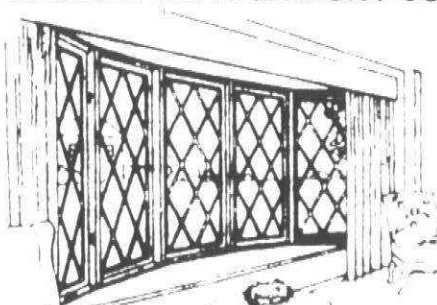


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Bear auctions off a 4-foot submarine sandwich during Sunday's benefit in Plymouth for the Michigan Humane Society.

## Animal benefit is a success

## First try at school budget is \$2 million in the red

The first-draft budget proposal for the coming fiscal year shows a deficit of about \$2 million for the school district.

The first-draft document is the allocation budget submitted by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools to Wayne County to justify its share of 8.9 mills of the 15 mills the county collects and distributes to local governmental units.

The allocation budget was approved by the school board 7-0 Monday night.

Although the allocation budget shows a deficit of some \$2 million, according to Superintendent John M. Hoben, the final budget will be balanced before presented to the board for approval in June.

The first-draft budget proposal for the coming fiscal year shows a deficit of about \$2 million for the school district.

Hoben said the budget is based on an assumption that student enrollment will increase by some 500 students between now and September.

Included in the loss in revenue is some \$1.1 million caused by a rollback of 1.32 mills in the operating rate required by the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment because the tax base this year increased by a greater amount than the rate of inflation.

Hoedel said the budget also provides for an expected cutback order in state aid from the governor of some \$340,000 this coming August.

Some of the major expense items, Hoedel said, included these expected increases: hospitalization premium hikes of about 10 percent; dental cover-

age cost increase of 36 percent; and increased charges for utilities ranging from 14 to 25 percent.

Another major expense item is the need to spend about \$350,000 to hire some 22 new teachers to maintain class size ratios in case student enrollment does increase by 500.

Of the total \$40 million proposed to be spent some \$22 million or 55 percent would be spent on instruction. The total spent on instruction will increase by about \$3 million or by some 16 percent.

The total tax base in the school district as a whole is some \$832 million compared to this year's total state equalized valuation (SEV) of almost \$674 million. Thus tax base has increased by some \$158 million or by 23.5 percent.

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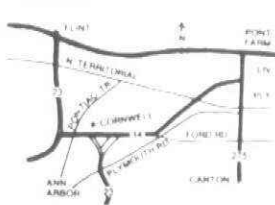
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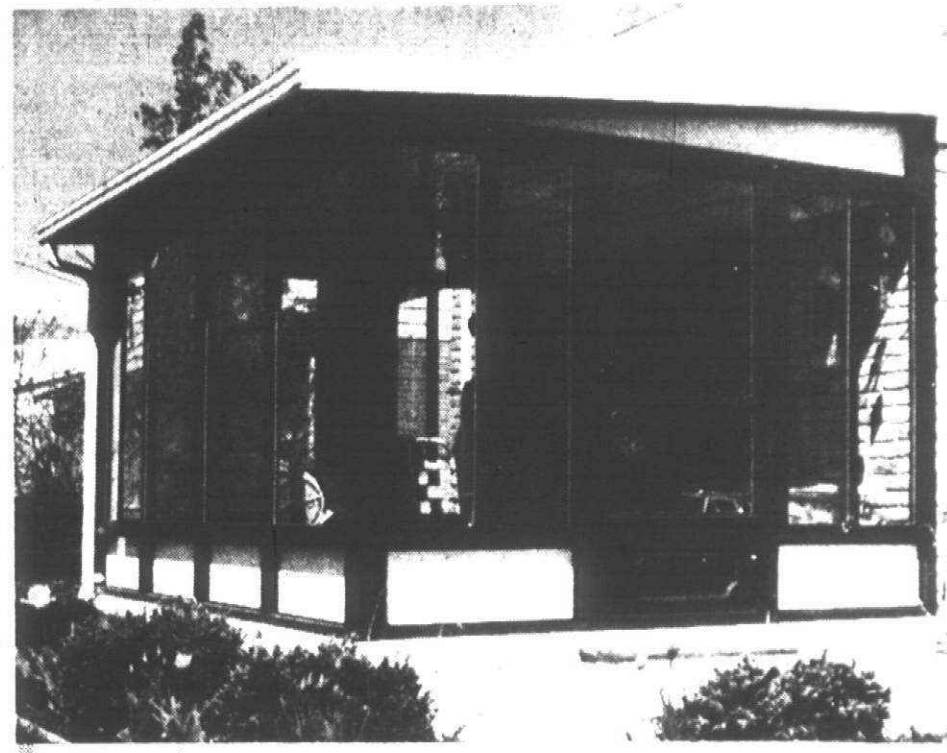

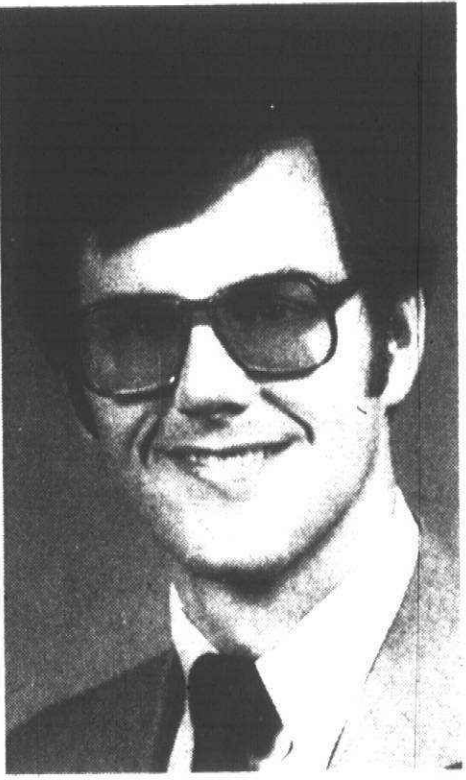

Auctions, such as this one, are what determine a car's worth because until money actually exchanges hands one can only speculate about value, he explained.

For the collector there are four types of cars: classic, milestone, antique, and special interest. Classic cars were built in limited production between 1925 and 1948; milestones are cars which mark major new ideas in styling, engineering and marketing such as the 1955-57 Thunderbird; and antiques generally are those built before 1925. The special interest is any type of car with unique appeal or one in exceptional condition. Cars in this group might include the Corvette, Mustang, Cadillac Eldorado.

Donoghue's two shops employ 35 fulltime craftsmen who specialize in all areas of interior work, woodworking, painting, engine rebuilding, and metal work.

Business Week plans are made

Plymouth-Canton Business and Education Week activities already have started even though the actual events don't take place until May 12-16.

Schools offer public life-saving courses

Have you ever witnessed an on-the-street heart attack and felt helpless in providing assistance?

The Plymouth Canton Community Schools is offering a course in cardiopulmonary-resuscitation (CPR) that's promoted as transforming the average shocked bystander into a cool, competent saver of lives in instances of cardiac arrest.

Through the district's community education department, 10 CPR workshops will be held for community residents beginning April 16 and running until May 21.

The workshops are free to the public and are limited to 15 people per session.

According to spokespeople for the community education department, cardiac arrest kills some 650,000 persons annually in the United States. Some 350,000 of those deaths occur away from medical assistance.

## Pinching the schools

# When taxpayers give, the state takes away

There is a major difference in the financing of services between school districts and municipalities which most residents don't fully appreciate.

Because of the misunderstanding many residents assume that the school district receives extra revenue when the total tax base (state equalized valuation) increases.

City and township governments, after all, will receive greater revenue for their budgets when the tax base increases and the millage rate is not lowered. But this does not occur with school districts, although many assume it does.

Because of the "equal yield" formula for distributing state aid to local school districts, payments from the state will drop as local tax base goes up.

The equal yield concept assumes that local school districts with rich tax bases can better afford to support educational programs than poorer districts. Therefore, school districts with less tax base per pupil than most districts statewide will receive more in state aid, and vice versa. The object is to provide equal opportunity by giving all students in

Michigan a chance at a good education inspite of the richness or poorness of the local tax base.

**LAST YEAR**, as most of us know by now, the tax base increased in the city of Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth townships. For Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, as a whole, the increase in tax base was roughly 20 percent.

Some of that potential increase in revenue was lost by a rollback in operating millage necessitated by the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment. Almost \$1.1 million in potential local income is being lost from the rollback.

After taking the rollback into account, the district will receive about \$4.3 million more in income from local property taxes for the 1980-81 school year. This is an increase in local property tax income of almost 17.5 percent.

But because state aid is based on SEV per pupil, the district will receive about \$1.4 million less from the state in '80-81 than it has for the current school year. This is a loss in state aid of about 15.3 percent.

The net result between the tax base rising and the state aid payments dropping is a two percent improvement in revenue. That 2 percent improvement certainly is not a "windfall" of income gained from rising SEV.

**ACTUALLY**, when all the other budget lines for the coming year are considered, the school district is looking at a proposed deficit of \$2 million or the equivalent of 2.5 mills.

Expenses projected for the coming year will increase by about 16.3 percent from this year while total revenues will increase by only 7.9 percent.

The result is that the school administration must trim its proposed budget by \$2 million in order to come up with a balanced proposed budget for board approval.

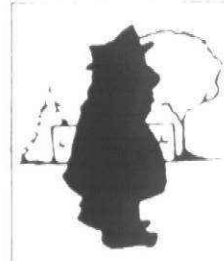
The 16.3 percent increase in expenditures isn't too far off from what it should be given an annual inflation rate of close to 20 percent and the "growth pressures" of an additional 500 students expected for the '80-81 school year.

Municipal governments do receive money from the state in the form of revenue sharing and use tax rebates. But none of these state payments decline as the local tax base rises. In fact, many of the state and federal payments actually increase in amount as the local population rises.

Thus, a population increase represents additional revenue for a municipality while a population increase represents additional expense for school districts. The difference, of course, is how the state decides it will redistribute tax funds to local units.

This difference in state funding was not recognized sufficiently when Headlee put together his tax limitation proposal. The result is that municipalities are allowed to keep pace with inflation while school districts fall behind.

While the fiscal future may not be bright for municipalities who also are struggling with rising costs, the future is downright dismal for school districts — especially for those few remaining with rising enrollments.

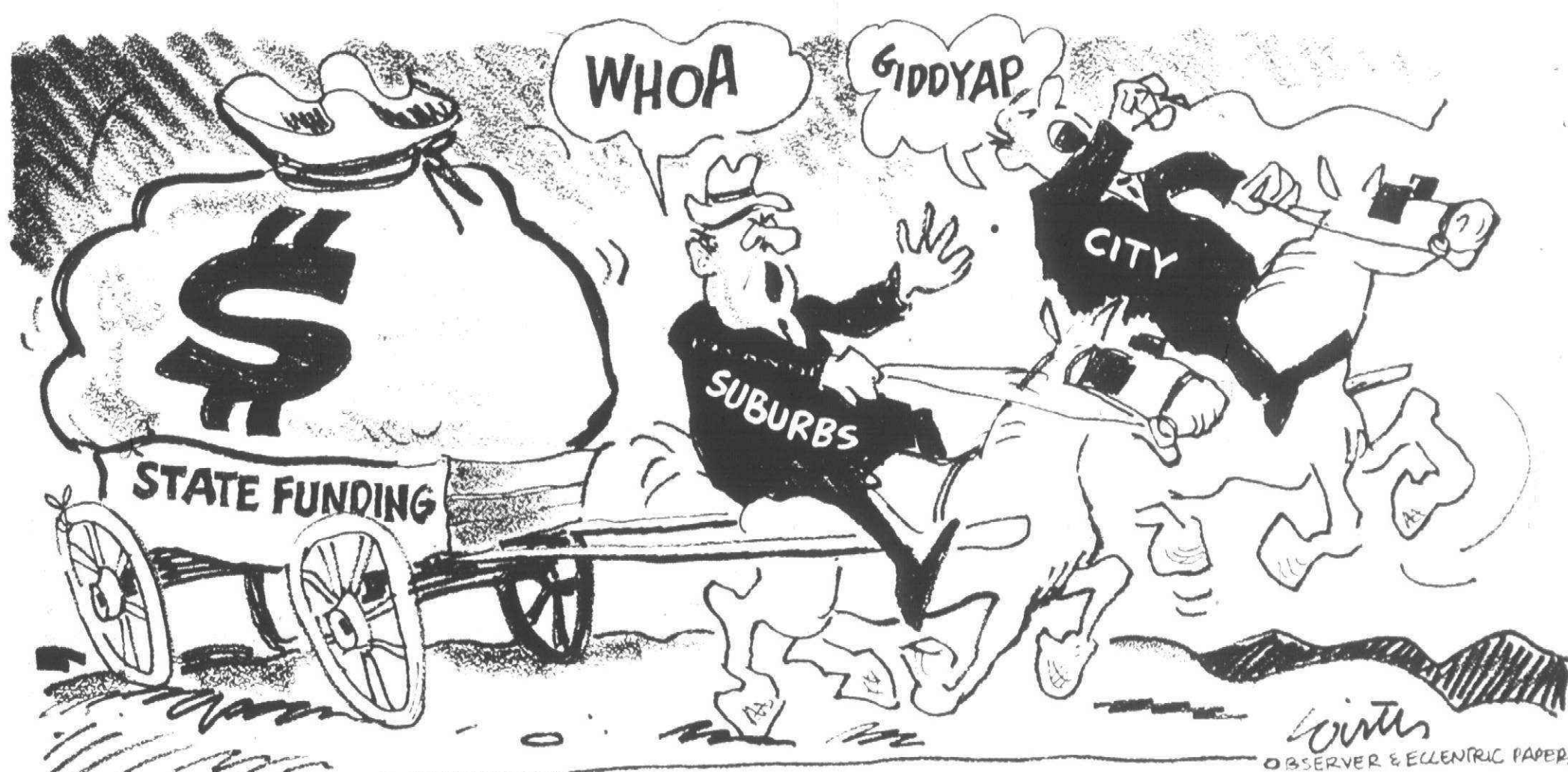

## Substance takes a back seat to tactics

This is far from the happiest time to be covering metropolitan politics.

Tensions between Detroit and the so-called "suburbs" are high. Name-calling frequently takes precedence over problem-solving.

What's happening is that the 1980 census count has been taken, preliminary results will be known later this year, and the only question will be how badly Detroit fares.

A new census means political reapportionment. The rush is on to get things done before reapportionment shifts a lot of power to the outlying area.

Consider these arenas:  
**SEMTA'S 1990** transit plan, usually referred to by lazy writers and politicians as the "Detroit subway."

The 15-member SEMTA board has five Detroiters, three from out-Wayne County, three from Oakland, two from Macomb and two from the smaller counties. That board last December approved a rapid transit plan with an underground line for Woodward from downtown to McNichols (Six Mile).

It's entirely possible that Detroit, out-Wayne and Oakland will have nearly equal populations, or even that Detroit will be the smallest of the three.

If the SEMTA board is reapportioned, and with all the delays the transit plan is running into, will the new board scrap the plan and go to an all-bus

system which some of the more backward suburban politicians prefer?

We can't forget the meddlesome Michigan Legislature, either. State funding will play an important role. All delays hurt the 1990 plan's chances.

The transit plan has already been delayed a couple of years by the federal bureaucracy's requirement that SEMTA perform an exhaustive, expensive "alternatives analysis."

What we now have is not a discussion of the rail plan on its merits but a fight between "hurry" and "wait."

**WAYNE COUNTY** home rule and administrative reorganization.

It's more than a Wayne County issue because a lot of state funding is involved.

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has

voted to put a charter commission question on the ballot. Internally, county politicians are split — Detroiters wanting an appointive county manager and suburbanites wanting an elected executive with more political clout.

If charter commissioners are elected this year, they are likely to come from districts that will give Detroit a 15-12 majority. The charter which is drafted will go to a vote in November of 1981, which just happens to be the time of Detroit's mayoral election with considerably less activity in suburbia. Chalk up a built-in advantage for Detroit.

Out-county politicians are likely to seek a court-ordered delay in order to allow for reapportionment under the 1980 census.

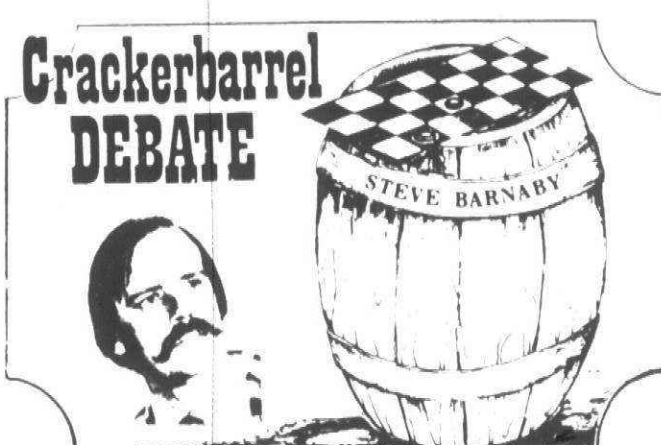

**URBAN PROGRAMS** in the state legislature and in Congress.

If a lot of domestic programs are cut now — as President Carter proposes in his balanced budget — they may not be restored when a reapportioned Congress, loaded with suburbanites and Sun Belters, gathers in a more prosperous 1983.

It's not a fun time to be covering metropolitan politics. One winds up writing about tactics and not substance.

## Housing prices don't measure real values



Now a calm is quickly coming over the land. And many homeowners are going to find themselves in an untenable position.

Not only is the buyer market drying up, but increased gasoline prices have stranded tens of thousands miles away from their jobs.

**ECONOMIZING** on driving is a losing battle. Prices just keep on rising with no relief in sight.

So many of us were wrong. It isn't the "value" of a house which is important. What is important is the value which we put on the community in which we live.

But instead of emphasizing community value, many of us have opted for property value — a very shaky barometer.

In Garden City, for instance, homeowners complain that a development of a group home for retarded will harm their property values.

In Birmingham, the city is entangled in a legal battle with the federal government over construction of low-income housing. Residents, once again, fear for their property values.

It's a sad commentary on the American way of life when we turn away from the human values of a community for the property values of our homes which are manipulated by forces over which we have little or no control.

spree, with homeowner hopefuls lining up to pay any price for a home. Instead of years, houses were changing owners in months.

Meanwhile, developers were having a ball. Making lots of bucks, they were gobbling up land and building subdivisions farther and farther away from the metropolitan area.

Historically, it is reminiscent of the hysteria which surrounded the Oklahoma land rush during the last century. But instead of racing to a plot of land on a horse, the new Americans jumped in their cars every Saturday and Sunday to seek out new land.

"You know, Steve, what's happening in our economy isn't all bad. Sure, it's hard to get through, but Americans have had too much, spent too much, gone overboard."

This epistle came from a local real estate dealer who wandered into the office the other day to drop off a press release.

The cordial greeting "how's business?" brought on the response.

"It's a good thing we've got land contracts or we all would be out of business right now," he continued. "But at least housing prices are beginning to come down."

"Something had to happen to stop this inflation in the housing market. People were just paying too much for their homes."

The conversation ended on a mutual note of sympathy for those who have paid top price for a home on which they probably never will get a full return because of the depressed housing industry.

**THIS PENCHANT** for "keeping up" property values has caused us all a lot of unnecessary grief. Frankly, we've too often let our hearts overrule our intellect when it comes to property values.

Over the years, in countless council meetings, inevitably someone gets up and questions how this or that issue will effect the property value of his home.

For years suburbia has been on a speculation

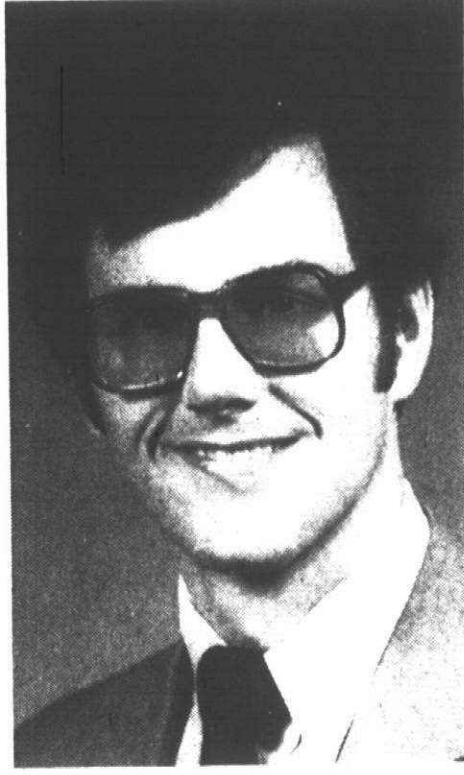

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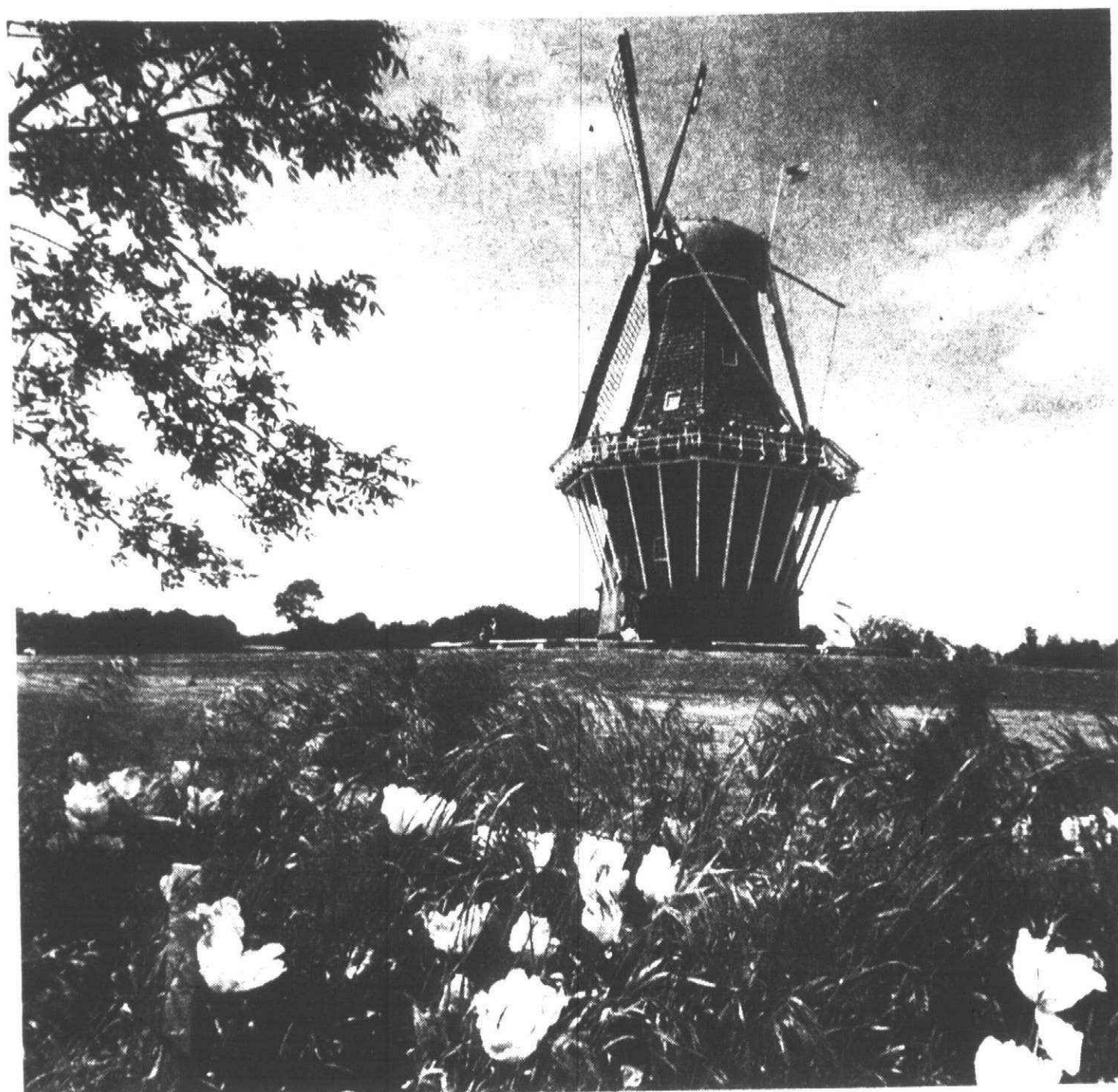

## Stop! Look at picture

A few weeks ago, we discussed the value of impact in your photographs and how impact can make the difference between ho-hum pictures and that shot that draws everyone's attention.

One of your best tools to add required impact to your photographs is good composition. Composition can be thought of as the effective placement of the main subject and supporting elements in the picture. Elimination of unnecessary and unwanted details in a photograph also are good composition.

The next time you look through your camera and are about to push the shutter, stop! Yes, stop and take a really good, long look.

Examine your subject. Is there a tree growing out of Aunt Sylvia's head? Have you placed her in a dynamically strong part of the frame? Look at all four corners of the viewfinder. Is there something there, perhaps distracting, that doesn't belong?

Good composition begins with a solid look through the camera and a determination of what you, the photographer, want to record on the film in the most effective way.

LISTED BELOW are some basic guidelines to help you plan and obtain good composition:

- Vertical vs. horizontal — Most cameras produce a rectangular negative and a resulting rectangular print. Always fit the picture to your subject. People and trees, for example, go up and down, so most often a vertical composition should be used. Horizons go sideways, so a horizontal format would be appropriate.

- Subject placement — Avoid placing the main subject smack in the middle of the picture. As you are looking through the viewfinder, imagine two horizontal lines and two vertical lines splitting the frame into nine equal parts. You'll notice that these imaginary lines, if real, would intersect at four points.

Placing your main subject near one of these intersecting points adds interest and a dynamic quality to your picture.

- Select the best camera position — Take a moment and study your subject to decide the best angle to shoot from. A low angle provides an uncluttered sky background when shooting out-

doors. Or shoot from a high angle to de-emphasize the sky on an overcast day.

Consider the horizon line, too. A low horizon line in your picture accentuates spaciousness, especially with white, fluffy clouds against a blue sky. Use a high horizon line to suggest closeness. Above all, think, and plan out your photograph.

- Use "lead-in" lines — The lines in a picture should lead attention toward the subject, not away from it. You can find such lines in almost all pictures. They can be roads, streams, fences, shadows, even parts of a building. Select a camera viewpoint to take advantage of these natural lines to effectively direct attention into the picture.

In essence, composition is the selection and arrangement of objects in your camera's viewfinder. Taking that extra long look and thinking about good composition will give your photographs more excitement and certainly more impact.

## Some yesterdays make up for lost tomorrows

"Tomorrow never was a day. All we have is yesterday."

Poetry was a secret my father kept hidden among his music sheets. Perhaps it was meant to be. When I found the poem containing the above lines, everything was yesterday.

Although Mom served quotations as a main course with every meal, I didn't digest the message until I was forced to learn from experience.

I had been married five years and busily occupied with small children when Daddy telephoned. Karen Dwyer, my dearest childhood friend, had been admitted to University Hospital in Ann Arbor with what the doctors termed acute anemia.

Despite Daddy's frequent phone calls to remind me, two weeks passed before I suggested to my husband we drive to Ann Arbor the following Sunday to visit Karen, whose condition was now described as "serious."

That Sunday morning over breakfast coffee, I scanned the morning paper. Somehow my eyes fell on the death notices.

"Karen Dwyer." My best friend had died the day before. Yesterday.

DADDY NEVER said "I told you so." He only said, "Don't ever take tomorrow for granted, especially when someone is ill."

He practiced that lesson. During his last year when he felt his heart condition was deteriorating, he began hiding notes in various places around the house.

When he was no longer alive to say the words, my mother would find a note reading, "I love you, Opal."

I relished the sweetness of every second during the last year. In May, Daddy wanted to go on a picnic for Mother's Day and we arrived at Metro-

politan Beach only to find the picnic tables still in storage.

Undaunted, we ate our sandwiches in the car, squeezed door-to-door with six kids, shivering with every bite but laughing.

HIS 69TH BIRTHDAY was in August and I insisted on a party, although his health didn't lend itself to the mood.

The cake was too special for a bakery to prepare, so I baked it, topping it with a picture of a little girl inscribed: "You are my happiness."

There were balloons, noisemakers and paper hats. The last picture I have of Daddy was taken at this party, surrounded by his family, garbed in his bathrobe and party hat.

Just as the words of "September Song" remind us — "the days grow short when you reach September" — they did.

One unforgettable afternoon, I felt an uncontrollable urgency building within me. So I took Daddy on a three-hour car ride.

I drove to all the places I remembered him taking me as a child, Belle Isle, Lake Shore Drive. I still

see him watching the sailboats festooning the lake.

We completed the tour at RenCen, which Daddy had never seen. Since I wanted him to experience the magnificence of the Plaza Hotel lobby, I drove onto the sidewalk to enable him a better view. I would have found a way to package the world to give him on a sterling platter if Daddy wanted.

WEEKS LATER, I escorted my parents to an airplane seat as they began their journey in a last attempt to find doctors to save Daddy's dwindling life. Placing his hands on my shoulders, Daddy hugged me tightly.

"You've been a wonderful daughter. I love you very much."

Those were the last words I ever heard my father speak. Yet nothing was left unsaid. Nothing left undone. If Daddy were to stand before me today, I would simply say, "I missed you, Daddy."

We never needed tomorrow.

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# Wayne County puts up blockade on effort to ban truck traffic

Plymouth Township's ordinance to ban truck traffic on two primary roads within its boundaries has run into a blockade put up by the Wayne County Road Commission.

In response to residents' complaints with such traffic on two stretches of Haggerty and Canton Center roads, an ordinance was enacted in the past few months that would restrict traffic there.

However, opposition from the road commission caused that ordinance to be as worthless as the paper it's written on.

"The ordinance is in effect but the only problem is we can't enforce it," says Township Supervisor Thomas Notebaert.

According to John Kinville, county engineer, only the county has jurisdiction over such roads and will not allow local ordinances to ban truck traffic

without approval from the county road commission.

And the road commission already has denied requests from Plymouth Township to ban truck traffic on Haggerty, between Ann Arbor and Plymouth roads, as well as on Canton Center Road between Joy and Ann Arbor roads.

"When highways were constructed, it was determined the county would have a system of roads provided for the movement of commerce and business, Kinville said. "And we can't start restricting the use of these roads for parochial interests."

ACCORDING TO Notebaert, the township targeted a ban on these two roads because of complaints from residents whose homes line the streets.

Most of the truck traffic, he said, heads north toward an industrial park in the city of Plymouth near the Bur-

rough's complex.

Additionally, concern was focused on Isbister Elementary School, which is on Canton Center Road.

Nels Carlson, township attorney, recommended last week that township officials put their ordinance in a holding pattern until similar local fights with the road commission are resolved.

"What we can do in terms of regulation is really up in the air," he said last Tuesday. "There is literally a fight going on between the Wayne County Road Commission and local communities."

"There's no doubt that Wayne County has the ultimate say."

In the city of Trenton, a similar fight has been going on for the past four years, says that city's administrator, Roy Musselman.

There, the county refused to restrict truck traffic on Jefferson Avenue where up to 60 steel haulers travel daily, he said.

"The citizens started to complain because of the noise created by trucks so the council decided to draft an ordinance that no vehicle could exceed 20,000 pounds."

That, in effect, would restrict most of the truck traffic that daily travels between two steel mills on Jefferson, he said.

However, when the city posted signs along the stretch proclaiming the ordinance, the county removed them.

Since then, Trenton has been facing two separate lawsuits. It lost its case to restrict traffic on Jefferson in Wayne County Circuit Court and recently decided to appeal.

It's also facing a half-million-dollar lawsuit filed by five Wayne County Road Commission workers who were arrested by Trenton police when they attempted to remove the city's ordinance signs.

# Wolves to stalk in soccer hunt

People who are always claiming that soccer is a growing and popular sport will have a chance to back up those claims this summer by supporting a new senior team in the area.

The Livonia Wolves will be based in Livonia and will compete in the best amateur league in the metropolitan area — the Detroit Soccer League.

The Wolves, heavily flavored with local talent, have been training at Schoolcraft College since January. They will open their 16-game schedule 2 p.m. Sunday at Henry Ford Community College against the Dearborn Eagles.

The Wolves will host Malta Sport Club 2 p.m. May 4 at Schoolcraft in their home opener.

Joe Mancini, coach of the Wolves, has been involved with soccer as a player, manager, coach or referee ever since he could walk as a youngster in Italy.

He has been in this country the past 23 years and has built a successful construction company in Redford.

Mancini has also been active with teams in the Detroit Soccer League during the past two decades. He says that the Wolves, although much younger in age than most players on other teams, should give an excellent accounting of themselves this season.

"I'm the coach and maybe I like them more than normal, but we played three (practice) games and they looked great. They looked excited," said Mancini.

"For physical abilities, we've probably got the best midfielders in the league," Mancini added. "Although they're only 19 or 20 years old, I think they're the best in the league."

The four midfielders — or playmak-

ers — of whom Mancini was referring are Frank Guerin, a Livonia Churchill graduate, Mike O'Shea, from Redford Bishop Borgess, Craig Pickard, Livonia Stevenson, and Claudio Mancini, Redford Thurston.

The goalkeeper is Dave Gray, who resides in Plymouth.

Other players who area fans might remember for their exploits on the field in the high-school ranks or at Schoolcraft College are Rick Laurie, Dan Naurato, T.J. Winters, Chuck Scoggins, Walt Barret and Barry Detherage.

Rounding out the squad are Ennio Petrella, Chip Stencil, Dano Prezioso, Emilio Troiani and Roberto Tedesco.

The Wolves were able to enter the league this season because one of last year's teams — Club Italia — no longer has a team.

Due to league procedures, sponsorship rules and bond requirements, the Wolves will formally be known as Club Italia-Livonia Wolves.

The club has made much of its equipment available to the Wolves, Mancini said.

"The boys are really good. We didn't want to play in the second division," said Mancini. "The opportunity was there (to play in the first division with the more skilled teams), so we jumped on it."

Several of the Wolves already had some experience competing in the Detroit Soccer League. Barret, Guerin, Laurie, Mancini, Naurato and Prezioso all played for Malta last year.

Mancini said that several of the players who eventually formed the Wolves wanted to start their own team rather than play for another club.

Some of the players and their parents met to discuss the possibility of forming their own squad. Mancini, who has been active as a coach in the Livonia Y Program and the Great Lakes Soccer League, was approached to coach.

Fund-raisers were planned, including sales of T-shirts and booklets and a dinner.

Businesses wanted to become sponsors when they found out through the grapevine that an area soccer team was forming. Mancini said that merchants and businessmen were not solicited, but came forward on their own.

Sixteen sponsors each donated \$200 to be used for uniforms, equipment, field rentals and officials.

The sponsors are Fonte D'Amore Restaurant, Gales Body Shop, Maria's Bakery, Cantoro Italian Market, Rainbow Construction, D'Orazio Construction Company, Rainbow Construction, Angelo D'Orazio Paving Company and Forum Cement Company.

Other sponsors are Oliver DeLuca Construction, DiPonio & Stante Construction, Redford Building & Supply, Primo Pizzeria, Bartoletti & Sons Masonry, Livonia Builders and Redford Cement Co.

Several other businesses donated money.

Things moved so fast, Mancini said, that the Wolves — a non-profit organization — has yet to adopt a constitution. "Forming a booster club is probably our next step," said Mancini.

For their part, the players have been diligently preparing for the upcoming season. They worked out indoors at Schoolcraft College 9 a.m. to noon Sun-

days through January and February.

They have been practicing outdoors lately when the weather has cooperated. Three exhibition games have resulted in three wins — 4-3 over Livonia 19-and-under Michigan Youth Soccer League, 4-1 over Malta and 3-0 over Garden City Bonanza.

"I think the kids are well-inclined to play," said Mancini. "They're outstanding kids, willing to learn, willing to listen and willing to do anything to improve. They're also very intelligent."

How far can the Wolves go this season?

"I don't want to get talking, but we're going to give it a helluva try. I'll be happy with second or third (place)," said Mancini.

"These boys are good boys," the coach said. "I hope they don't get cocky."

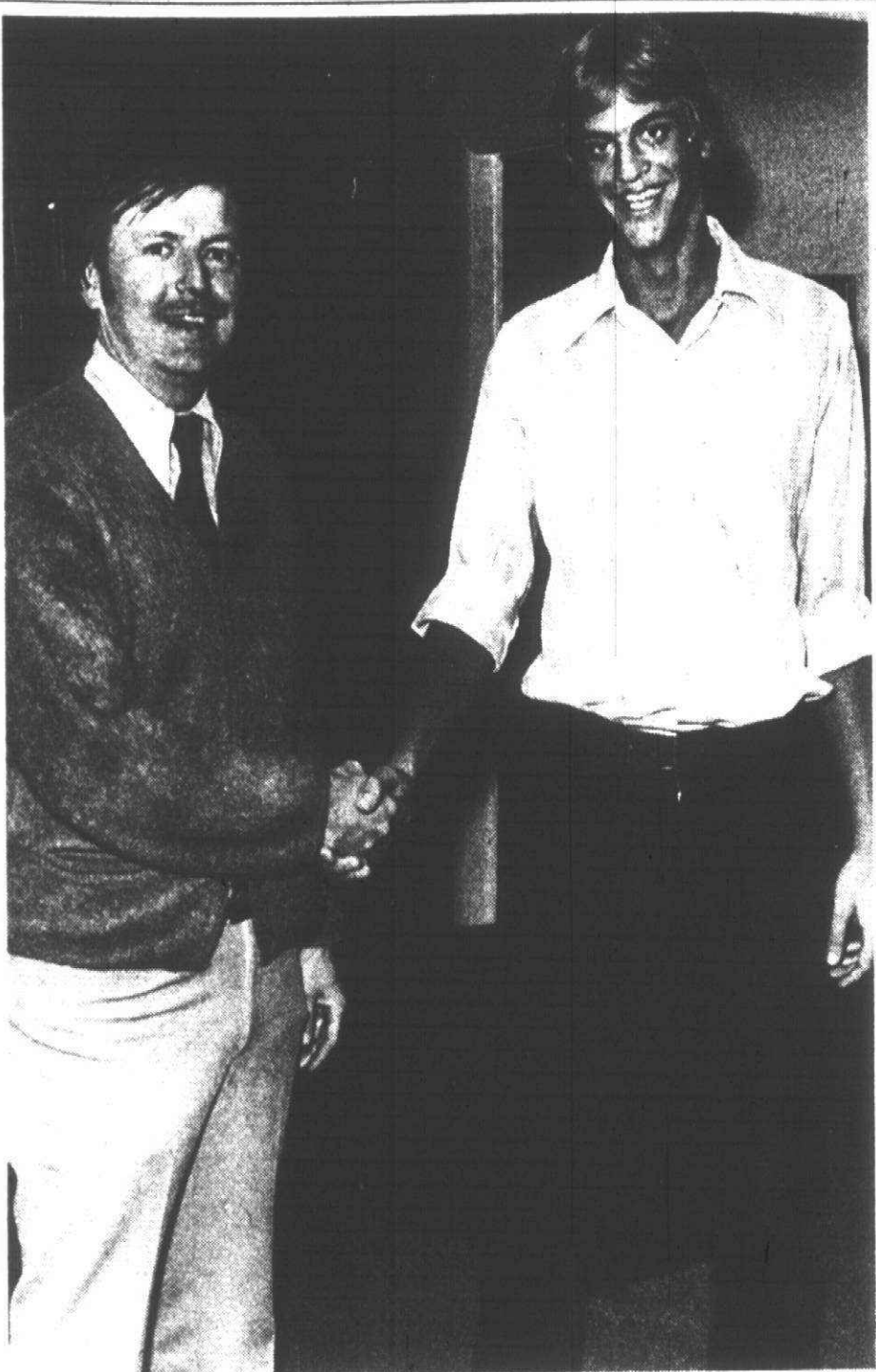

Wayne State University capped off a successful basketball recruiting season by landing 6-foot-6 guard-forward Dave Visser of Plymouth Canton.

The Canton standout, who averaged 13.6 and 8.5 rebounds a game during Canton's 17-7 season, signed a national letter-of-intent Tuesday afternoon. He is the first Canton basketball player to gain a full-ride scholarship.

THE CANTON MVP was also contacted by such schools as Hope, Alma, Lake Superior State and Emporia State of Kansas.

"At first I wasn't interested in

Wayne at all," said the soft-spoken Visser. "I decided to take a visit and was really impressed."

"I like the atmosphere of the Wayne State campus, and I'm looking forward to joining the basketball program which is really starting to build."

"I liked coach Payne because he was straightforward. I know he can build a winner."

Visser is also looking forward to teaming up with Monk.

"We've always played against each other and had a mutual respect," said Visser. "I know if I get him the ball he'll score. Everytime we played against each other it was always stop Howard."

A member of the National Honor Society, Visser is "thinking about a career in business."

"I was really impressed with all of Wayne's programs," he said.

Visser, a four-year letter winner and All-Leaguer in golf, will also participate on Wayne's team in the spring.

"We're pleased with Dave's decision," added Payne. "We went after four players and signed three. I'm very happy."

VISSER BEGAN playing basketball at an early age. He attended Central Middle School and made the varsity as a junior at Canton.

His father, Bob, a teacher at Livonia Franklin High School, coached at Franklin for 10 years as head varsity basketball coach. He directed the team to many fine seasons and coached such players as U-D's Kevin Kaseta.

His mother, Suzanne, is employed as a child care teacher in the Plymouth-Canton School District. Dave is the youngest of three children.

Trivial, yes. But it's something Fred Smith, Ernie Harwell and Tiger fans can enjoy — for a second time.

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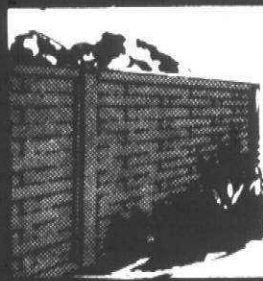
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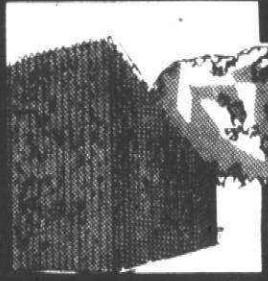
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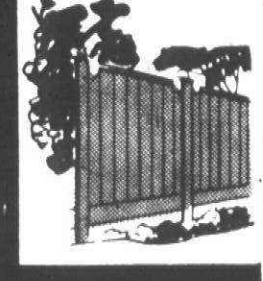
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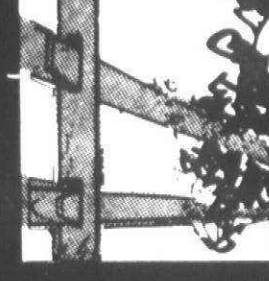
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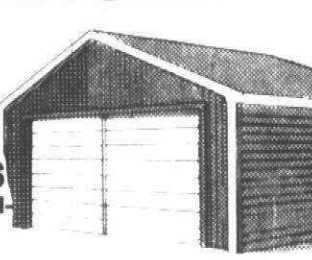


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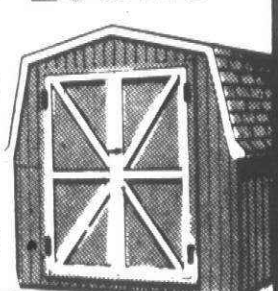
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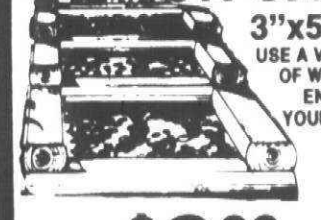
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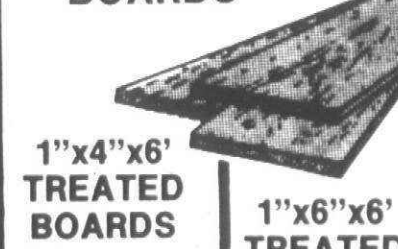

# Learn to identify diet 'authority'

I was handed a press release recently about a nutrition seminar and asked to run the notice in my column.

But the details of the release were nebulous. A certain nutrition "expert" would be conducting this seminar, but no credentials appeared next to his name. I wondered. So I made a few phone calls.

I was told that the expert was arriving from California. When I asked about his topic, I was told, "Nutrition, I guess."

"How is this man qualified to speak about nutrition?" I asked. "What is his experience? Is he a graduate nutritionist? Where did he attend school? Where has he made his mark?"

THE SPOKESMAN on the other end of the conversation had no answers. "Well," he said, "the brochure I have here doesn't say anything about this, but it tells about his life."

I asked that the brochure be read to me and he said it described the speaker as a "walking miracle."

"As a young man, he enjoyed success most men only dream about," he read. "Then he fell deathly sick with polio only three months after his wedding. He lived in misery and defeat for 10 years. Finally someone shared with him the dream of regained health through nutrition — and of building a multi-million dollar company, the rival of corporate giants."

"What's he selling?" I interrupted. "Are you familiar with X company?" I said I was. I recognized it as a firm

that sells vitamin pills and health supplements.

"Well, he was with that company," my informant explained. "Now he has one of his own."

"Will he be selling products at the nutrition seminar?" I asked?

He said no, but there would be a display of products, so I asked for the company's literature.

WHEN IT ARRIVED, the reason for the seminar seemed obvious to me. The visitor was seeking to recruit distributors for the products of his corporation.

There is nothing wrong with that.

## Grow your own

Yeast — Save money and raise your own. Send a self-addressed stamped envelope and 10 cents in coin to the International Food Storage Association (YT), PO Box 249, LaVerkin, Utah 84745.

But I object to the fact that the meeting is disguised as a nutrition seminar.

Mr. X. may, in fact, have regained his health through use of these products. But that has nothing to do with the point I'm making here.

That point is that it's important to ask questions about those represented as authorities, diet experts, nutritionists, dieticians.

Ask them, and don't stop until you are satisfied. There is a difference between an authority in the health field and an authority by way of personal experience.

EITHER MAY BE effective. But you

should know how to gauge expertise by asking about qualifications. Know what you want and then trust your instincts to form judgments.

For example, do you remember Dr. Robert Linn's "Last Chance Diet"? Here was a diet devised by someone in the medical field. But it wasn't safe. Did this man have credentials? You might say so, but this was a case of using common sense and good judgment. For the 50 who lost their lives, perhaps someone's judgment was impaired.

What about the book written by the man or woman who lost over 100 pounds and kept it off forever? Is he or she an authority figure? I'd say the book is probably worth reading but the method may not be safe for you. However, most of those books have good psychological value.

Seminars are a dime a dozen today. Learn to scrutinize who is trying to sell you on the best method for losing weight and applying nutritional principles. And trust your instincts. If something doesn't seem quite right, chances are it probably isn't.

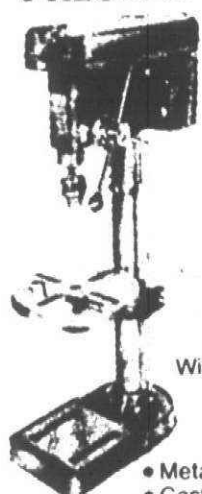

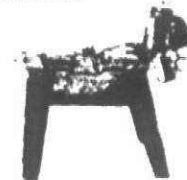

## The VIEW from CANTON CENTER

GLENNY Merillat found a postcard the other day that somehow seems timely. It had been mailed to her father, Este Merillat of 1292 Main Street, Plymouth, on Dec. 31, 1951.

On one side, it bore the notation: "Save this card — it is historic! It is likely the last 1¢ Card you will ever receive. TOMORROW (Jan 1, 1952) Postal cards go up 120 percent. The result of inflation by the administration!"

The sender was a Plymouth businessman, Roy Pursell. He was vitally interested in politics and was a well-read, thoughtful man. Roy Pursell also was an activist. He was not content to sit idly by and let events run their course.

Roy Pursell stated his opinions, flat-

ly and fluently. A child growing up in the Pursell household must have been exposed to political concerns and conversations from the cradle.

So it is not surprising to hear his son, U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, calling for "more cooperation among special interest groups in an effort to balance the federal budget and boost the ailing economy."

The son's approach is calmer and probably more reasonable. His father was not a patient man.

Getting back to the postcard — the last penny postcard. On the back of the card he had printed a poem which he attributed to the Houston Dental Journal:

### DON'T WORRY

"Father, must I go to work?"  
"No, my lucky son;  
We are livin' now on easy street,  
On dough from Washington.

"We've left it up to Uncle Sam,  
So don't get exercised;  
Nobody has to give a dam,  
We've all been subsidized."

"But if Sam treats us all so well,  
An feeds us milk and honey;  
Please, Daddy, tell me what the hell  
He's going to use for money?"

"Don't worry, bub, there's not a hitch  
In this here noble plan;  
He simply soaks the filthy rich  
And helps the common man."

"But, Father, won't there come a time

"My faith in you is shrinking, son,  
You nosy little squealer;

Don't you love it? I wonder how many how many others took Roy Pursell's advice and saved that last penny postcard.

## Symphony season ends with a 'Passion'

Sunday's concert by the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra will feature two firsts: The premiere performance of "Passion," a major choral work, and a woman as guest conductor of the orchestra.

Dr. Marilyn Jones was invited to be guest conductor for this concert because of her extensive instrumental and choral background. As an accomplished flutist, she has performed frequently with the orchestra. Dr. Jones has been on the faculty of Wayne State and Western Michigan universities. She is now choral director at Cass Tech High School.

The Schoolcraft Community Choir will join the orchestra in presenting "Passion," which is based on the Gospel according to St. Matthew. Commissioned by Schoolcraft College, the work was composed by Robert Jones, specifically for these two performing groups.

Jones is no ivory-tower composer. Having been an instructor at Schoolcraft since 1969, he knows his performers and his audience. A prolific composer, he uses his creativity to write for diverse groups, ranging from organ and electric tape to more standard works for chorus. Many of these are currently in publication.

ALTHOUGH FILLED with surprises and 20th century expression, the work is reminiscent of its predecessors in many respects.

J.S. Bach is generally credited with the culmination of this form in his "St. Matthew Passion." In these composi-

tions, the chorus takes either the part of the mob or that of a commentator on the passing events of the drama. These commentaries typically are inserted between the scripture passages and in Jones' work, take the form of poems written by the composer's wife, Anne.

Anne Jones is an experienced writer and journalist. She has contributed to the uniqueness of the work in highlighting the role and feelings of the women in the drama. Several major choral selections are based on her poems.

Other references to choral tradition occur in the accompaniment of Jesus' words by the string section - almost as a kind of halo effect - and of the narrator by the keyboard.

Other effects would have shocked a 17th century audience. The shouting mob is quite realistically portrayed.

DAVE JONES, husband of Marilyn, completes the quartet of Joneses who have collaborated on the production. He, too, is a musician - both jazz and classical. His contribution in this case

was in his role as professional music copyist.

Rarely does a group performing an original work enjoy working from a clear, readable manuscript. His background as music copyist for the Detroit Symphony and arranger for other groups contributed greatly to the choir's enjoyment in rehearsing "Passion."

Soloists engaged for the performance are distinguished professionals.

Carolyn Grimes, soprano, has sung with the Plymouth Symphony several times. She has soloed with the Detroit Symphony and the Kenneth Jewell Choral.

Tenor Phillip Mooney is a principal tenor with the Michigan Lyric Opera Company and soloist at Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Detroit.

Carroll Strickland, who will sing the role of Jesus, has been active in the Lyric Opera Company and in the Detroit Institute's "Brunch with Bach" series.

Brian Murphy is an English professor at Oakland University who

received his doctorate from the University of London. He will read the part of Pontius Pilate.

THE CHOIR, in its 15th year, is comprised of 60 singers representing 17 metropolitan area communities and a variety of musical backgrounds.

The choir provides experienced singers an opportunity to enhance their choral singing skills while making quality musical performances available to the community. Past concerts have featured Mozart's "Requiem" and Brahms' "Liebeslieder Walzer."

Tickets for the concert may be purchased at the door or in advance from Beitner Jewelry, Ann Arbor Trail; Plymouth Book World, Forest Street; or Heide's Flowers, Ann Arbor Trail at Harvey. Admission will be \$4 for adults and \$2 for senior citizens, and for college students. Students kindergarten through 12th grade will be admitted free.

A Girl Scout troop will provide babysitting for preschoolers during the concert at 4 p.m. Sunday, April 20 in Plymouth School High School auditorium, Joy Road west of Canton Center Road.

Free transportation for senior citizens is provided from Tonquish Creek Manor at 3:15 p.m., and return there after the performance.

The concert is made possible with the support of the state of Michigan through a grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts and from Schoolcraft College.

Post office substations of the U.S., United Nations, Canada and Sweden will be present with their show cancels and stamps.

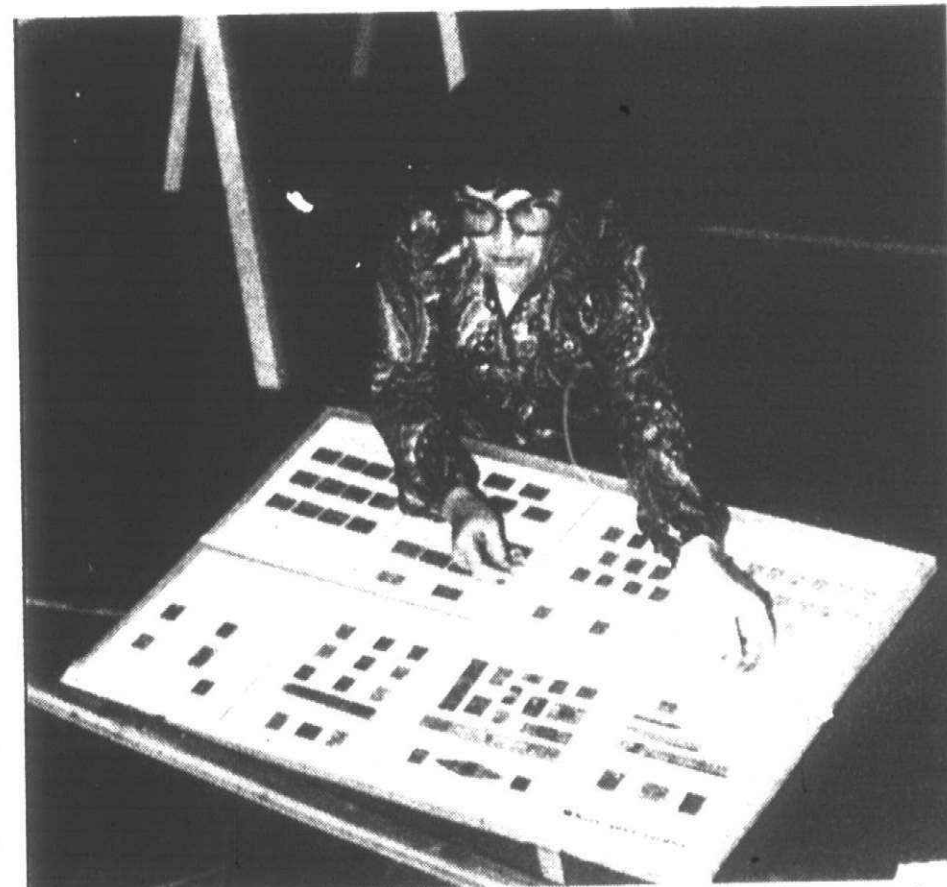

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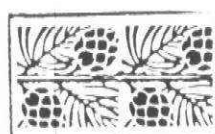
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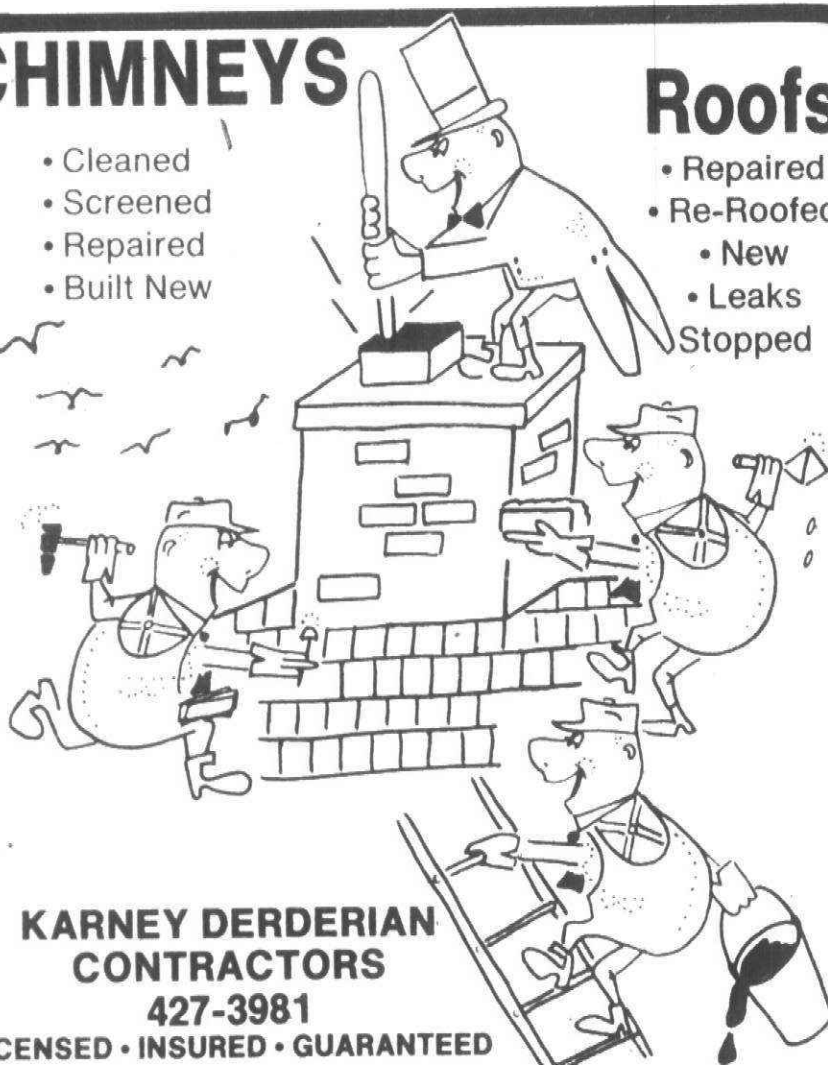
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# RNs to have seminar on handling problems

It may be a skinned knee, a bee sting, a peculiar rash or a fever, the immediate health care resource person in the neighborhood is the nurse who lives down the street. The nurse is often called upon to advise and recommend family management of common health problems.

The Plymouth Registered Nurses Association and the University of Michigan School of Nursing are cooperating in a workshop, "Neighborhood Triage," to assist nurses in their role of family and neighborhood health advisor. The day-long seminar will be from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Saturday, May 3 in Plymouth Canton High School auditorium, Canton Center Road at Joy.

Triage is defined as "the determination of priority of need and proper source of help or treatment in the event of medical emergency or health care requirement."

Goals of the workshop are to clarify four points for the participants:

- Collect information from the "caller" about what has happened or is happening.
- Convert the collected information into action.
- Help the family cope with the incident.
- Determine "what a reasonable and prudent person in my situation would do."

Mrs. White stressed that the annual meeting is open to prospective members who should call Mary Ellen McKercher, 455-4539, for reservations.

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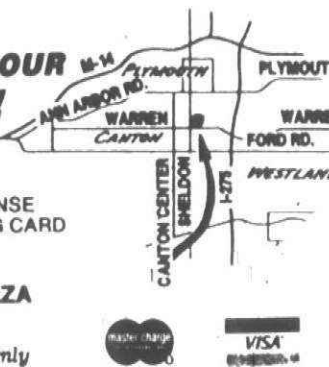
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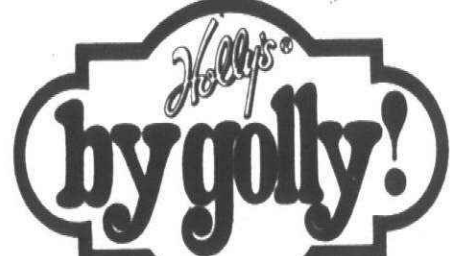
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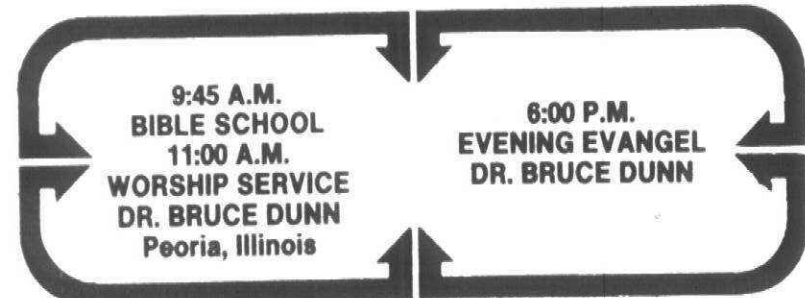
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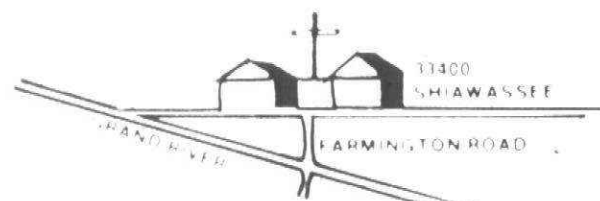

## End Sunday events, area clergy urges

A halt to the Sunday-morning scheduling of community events, including little league games, is urged by the Livonia Ministerial Association.

The association, an ecumenical group of pastors, priests and parish workers representing church families in Livonia and the surrounding area, has sent letters to community leaders and athletic groups asking that events not be scheduled during the hours families worship in church.

"Once upon a time, Sunday morning was reserved for worship," said the Rev. Robert C. Seltz, pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and president of the association.

"Now many families who desire to be involved in both church and community events find themselves faced with difficult decisions."

"Johnny wants to participate in sports. But sometimes games and practice sessions occur at the same time as church and Sunday school. Is it fair to force Johnny to choose between worshipping God and playing hockey, for example?"

Seltz said the ministers considered both religious and community activities important for healthy development of children and adults.

Their contention, he added, is that church and community leaders should work together instead of in competition with each other in "providing growth opportunities for citizens."

Seltz said the group had received answers from a few of those contacted, indicating they would try to avoid Sunday morning scheduling.

## Hearing-impaired dancer to perform

Kirsten Moomey, a hearing-impaired student who comes from a theatrical family, will dance to the music "You Light Up My Life," for the 9:30 and 11 a.m. series at St. Timothy United Presbyterian church Sunday.

Miss Moomey, 19, is a student at Madonna College and daughter of actor Bob Moomey and choreographer Sally Moomey.

"She is on a crusade," said the Rev. Dickson Forsythe, minister of the church at 16700 Newburgh, Livonia.

"She firmly believes that everyone should have an opportunity to participate in the performing arts and feels that most of the hearing-impaired and

other handicapped persons are denied this opportunity.

"Her ultimate goal is to establish a theater and a dance studio for these people."

Miss Moomey will appear next week before the Illinois State Legislature in a drama written by her father and sponsored by the International Association for the Deaf.

The drama, titled "The Family," is aimed at promoting better understanding between the hearing and the non-hearing. In previous acting ventures, Miss Moomey has worked with Nanette Fabray, a hearing-impaired performer who has given her encouragement.

# Big Brothers are in demand



Eleven boys in Canton are waiting for a Big Brother, someone to spend sometime with them, to listen to their troubles and to direct them toward new interests.

Big Brother/Big sister, a Torch Drive agency, is recruiting men and women over the age of 18 who are interested in helping children between the ages of 8 and 17 on a one-to-one basis.

Interested persons should contact the Big Brother/Big Sister Office, The Detroit Area address is 2990 W. Grand Blvd., Suite 408, Detroit 48202; telephone 873-3300; and for Western Wayne County, the address is 26279 Michigan Ave., Inkster MI 48141, telephone 465-2146.

The Plymouth-Canton community presently has 21 volunteers in the program. The organization receives support from the Plymouth Community Fund and the Plymouth Kiwanis.

**BIG BROTHERS** and Big Sisters make a commitment to spend time with a Little Brother/Little Sister at least once a week for a year. What the volunteer and the child do on the weekly visits depends on their interests. They might share a hobby, play a game or run errands.

Big Brothers/Sisters are encouraged to expose their young friend to new experiences, but should not feel they have to take him out for a special outing each week.

Emphasis is always on the supportive friendship that develops rather than on the amount of money spent.

Children and their sponsors are matched as to geographical location

(ideally, they should be no more than 15 minutes apart) and interests. A social worker screens both volunteers and children, and maintains a periodic contact to make sure things are going well. She gives help if any problems arise.

The service is directed to helping children from single parent households.

**TO GET** a Big Brother/Sister, the parent should call the nearest office or the 24-hour inquiry hotline, 273-6445.

Studies by the organization have shown that children from one-parent families form a disproportionate number of school dropouts and delinquents. Their figures state that the chances are three to four times greater.

The 1970 U.S. Census reported that there were almost 100,000 children between the ages of 8-17 living in one parent families in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties, and this number has grown in the past 10 years.

Big Brother/Big Sister officials estimate that 20 percent of these families could benefit from the service. In 1976, the organization served 3,253 children, or about 17 percent of the number who could have used the help.

Research has shown that the organization has been helpful to the children it serves.

More than 90 percent of the respondents in a survey done in the Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties in 1977 reported that the help of a Big Brother or Big Sister had made the child feel better about himself, and had given him new interests and experiences.

More than 80 percent said that their child was getting along better at home; that teacher relations had improved;

and that the child was getting along better with other children.

More than 70 percent said that their child's grades and school attendance had improved, and that the child had been less involved with police and the courts.

**STUDIES** throughout the country have shown similar results.

Improvement in behavior followed a pattern, reported one study in Toledo, Ohio. First, the improvement came with the Big Brother, then in the

school, followed by the community, and lastly in the home.

It also said a greater rate of change occurred in the second year.

Big Brother/Sister officials point out that in addition to a needed and effective service to children and youth, the service provides an opportunity for individuals to participate in solving a serious problem in the community.

Volunteers become more aware of and involved in meeting other community needs.

You can be sure these people suffer from attendant health problems: heart trouble, stomach trouble, liver trouble, headaches, sinus trouble, sciatica, ear trouble, are only a few. They may suffer from any of the nearly 400 different diseases or conditions caused by misaligned vertebrae pinching on nerves.

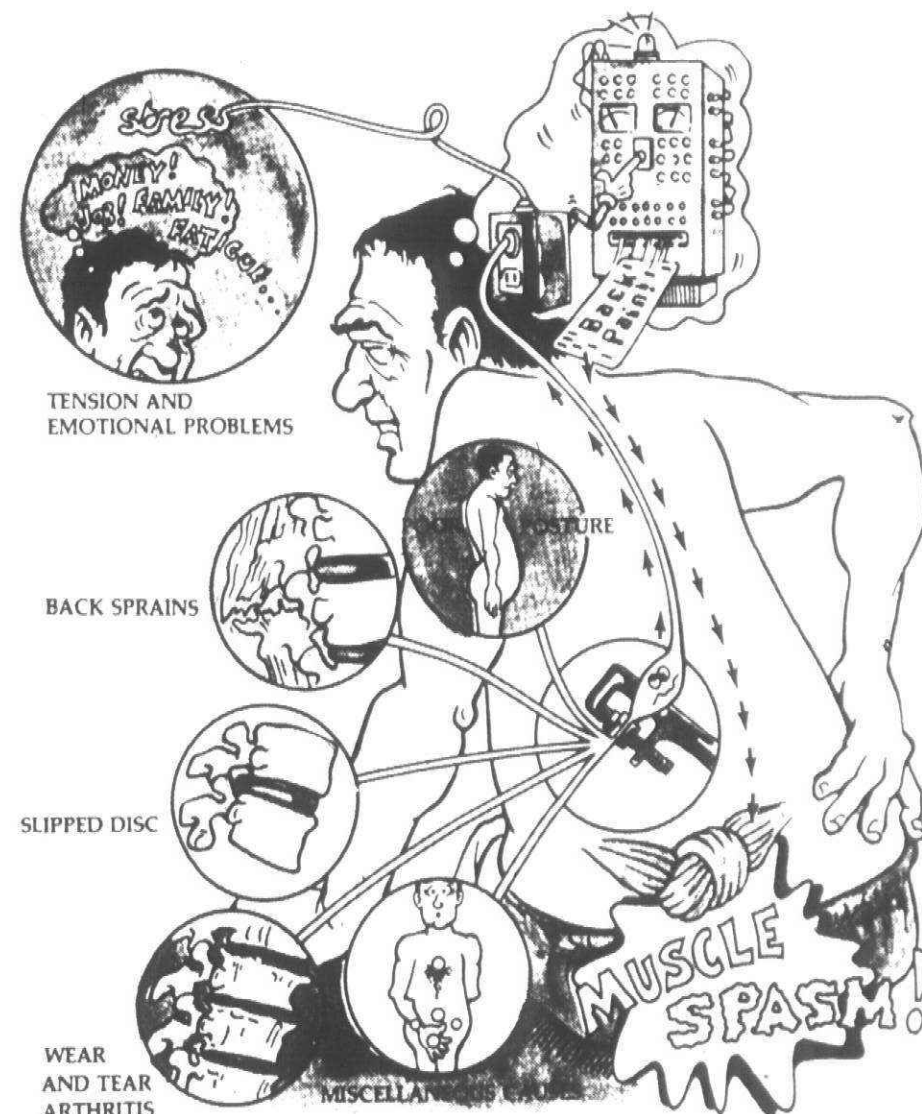

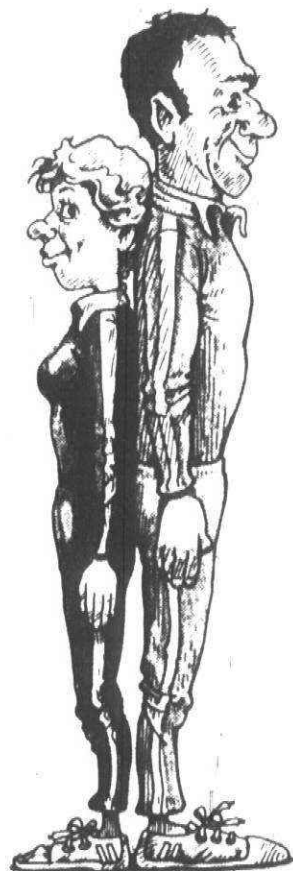

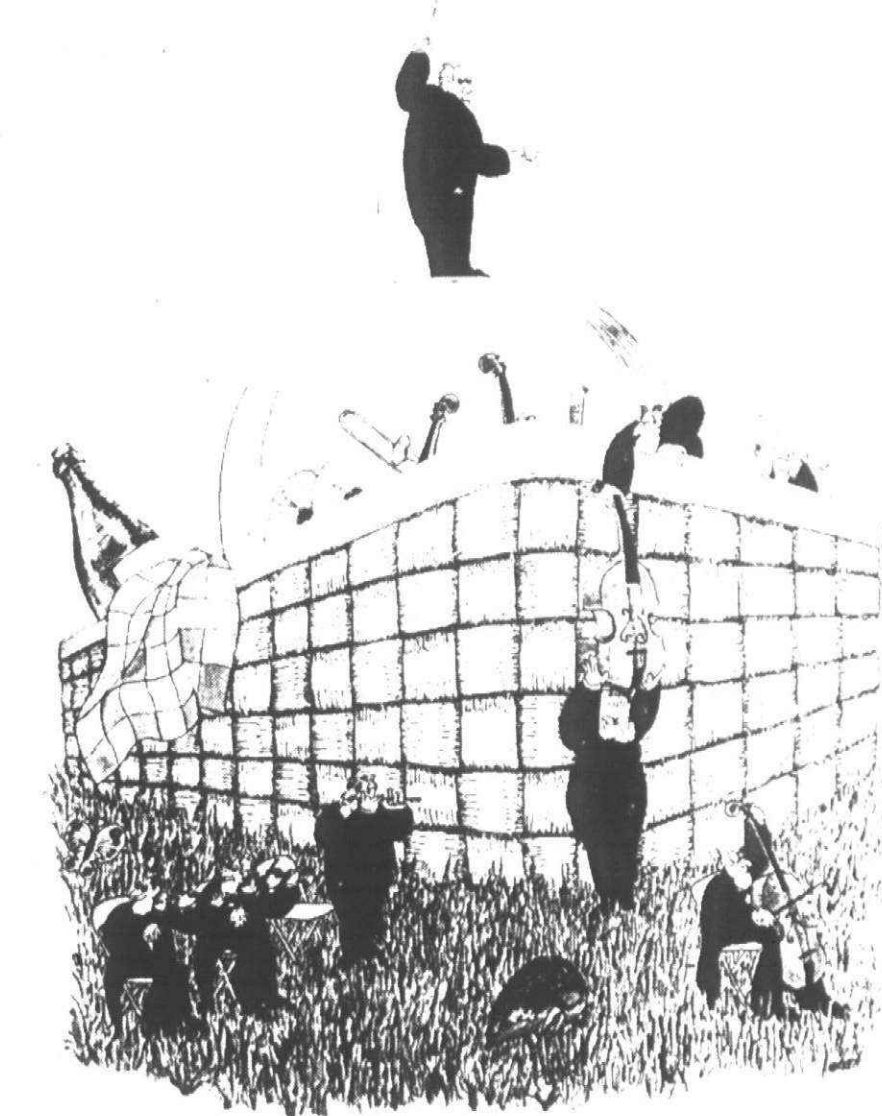
The festival runs through August. In addition to the Thursday/Saturday symphonic series, it includes a Friday night variety series and a Sunday pops series.

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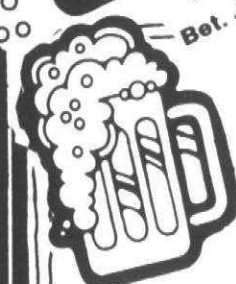

## Fishing more dangerous than hunting

A couple weeks back, I told you the boys up in Lansing were fixing to hike rates for various hunting and fishing licenses. Acting Gov. James Brickley made it official last week, signing House Bill 4822.

The new law will boost license fees on a staged, two-year basis. By the second year — which begins April 1, 1981 — standard fishing licenses will increase from the old \$5 to \$7, a 40 percent increase; trout and salmon stamps will be increased by the same amounts.

The increases also apply in similar percentages to a wide variety of hunting licenses. Overall, the state estimates the new rate structure will add up to \$6 million more for the state Fish and Game Fund by next year.

**SPEAKING OF DYING**, and we were, weren't we? There's a common conception that you create a dangerous situation by putting a few thousand armed men out into the woods, especially when a lot of them don't know which end of the gun works.

Surprise. The DNR has completed a study of sporting fatalities covering 1962-77. There was an annual average of 45.6 fishing-related fatalities during that period, compared to only 15.5 annual hunting accidents.

Fishing-related fatalities, by the way, is what the DNR says when it means drowning. Hunting-related fatalities is what they mean by being shot, either with a gun or an arrow.

In 1977, when fishermen accounted for some 16

percent of the state's drownings, a fishermen drowned on an average of once every 10 days.

Most fishing-related drownings — and there were 730 in the 15-year study period — are the result of falling out of boats, or of boats capsizing.

The DNR offers some common-sense tips on making sure your name doesn't end up on their list of statistics. Things like learning to swim, wearing life jackets, not standing in the boat, not running over anything with the boat, not boating during storms, not overloading the boat, and fishing people out of the water over the stern instead of on the side of the boat. And turn off those propellers first.

It leaves Lem wondering, too. But that's neither here nor there. Half the purchase price is tax-deductible. You can get the calendar by sending a check to Michigan's Living Resources Program, Box 30028, Lansing 48909.

**CANOE, TOO**, if you like this Sunday. There will be a spring canoe-in Sunday at 1 p.m. Bring a canoe

— there are no rentals available — and meet at the Bend Picnic Area of Willow Metropark near New Boston. You'll cruise down the beautiful Huron River to Oakwoods Metropark near Flat Rock. Transportation back to your car will be provided. Try not to run down any wading fishermen en route.

**SPEAKING OF BOATS**, if you've got one you might be interested in the following list of state-operated launching sites:

Sites are available at Metro Beach, near Mt. Clemens, at Stony Creek near Rochester and at Kensington near Milford.

You need a 1980 boat permit, which costs \$7 annually, \$4 for seniors, and \$2 for a daily permit. You'll also need a park permit, which costs the same as the boat permit except the seniors' rate is \$2.

Metro Beach has ramps on a creek feeding into Lake St. Clair. It can handle eight boats simultaneously, but the lot only has room for 210 trailers and cars. Ramps open at 7 a.m. and close at dusk, and there's a \$2 parking charge for cars left overnight. Call 463-4581 (Mt. Clemens) or 963-3022 (Detroit) for more information.

Stony Creek is north of Utica, near Rochester, and has room for 10 simultaneous launches onto the south end of Stony Creek Lake. There's space for 150 cars and trailers to park, but cars are not permitted to stay overnight. Hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. now, with a 10 p.m. closing later in the season. Call 781-4242 for more information.

Kensington has two launching sites on Kent Lake. At the eastern site, six boats can be launched at once and there is space for 60 cars and trailers and added space for cars only. The western site has space for 125 cars and trailers, and a 120-foot ramp that allows six to eight simultaneous launches. 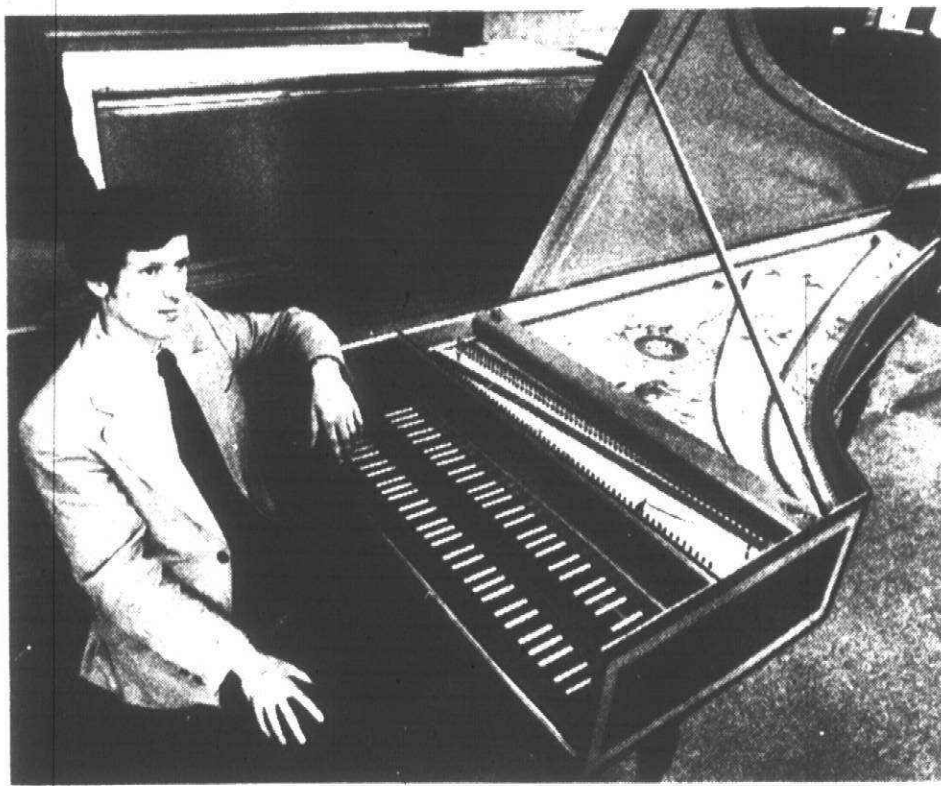

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# Artifacts of early Detroit on display in museum

Excavations for new structures in downtown Detroit have yielded archaeological artifacts which are the subject of an exhibit currently on display at the Detroit Historical Museum.

When land was cleared and foundations laid for the Renaissance Center, the Ponchartrain Hotel, Hart Plaza and the Joe Louis Arena, archaeologists were there — following the bulldozers and ducking the steam shovels to recover artifacts reflecting life in Detroit in the early 19th century. They recovered thousands of artifacts from the four sites.

Many pieces of ceramic vessels

which probably were on Detroit dining tables in the 1830s and '40s along with glassware, toys and other remnants of Detroit's past are included in the display. Maps and photographs portray the sites, which range from privy holes on former residential property to a massive collection of ceramics discarded by an importer when they were broken in transit in a Great Lakes storm.

"Renaissance on the Riverfront" will be at the Detroit Historical Museum, 5401 Woodward, until September. The museum is open 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, Friday and Saturday; 1-9 p.m. Wednesday; and 1-5 p.m. Sunday.

## 4 simple rules for storing wine

For all kinds of reasons, some rational and others not, most of us find we want to lay away certain wines for future drinking. And the idea has merit.

Early purchase usually saves money, it is more convenient and it permits the development of a delicious sense of anticipation. There is pride in the possession of a well selected cellar full of promised delights for some forthcoming special occasion.

But there are hazards. Much has been written of these, followed generally by a complex set of rules that can frighten one away from the task. It is amazing how many words are written by esteemed wine writers to convey but four simple messages regarding safe storage.

These rules are generally expressed to apply to the storage of reds. They hold for whites as well. It is just that whites aren't generally held as long as reds, so the issues are less critical.

- The first matter has to do with the temperature at which wine is stored. There are two aspects, average temperature and variability. The best storage temperature is 52-55 degrees Fahrenheit. More is known about the effects of storing wine at higher average temperatures than this, than about wide variability in temperature.

Heat increases the rate of maturation of wine, and that is the sole negative influence it has, up to a mean well into the high 70s or low 80s.

**THE RULE** of thumb is that for each 10 degrees mean storage rate, the wine development will increase a year. Thus, a 1976 Bordeaux stored at a constant 63 degrees will develop today to be as mature as it would "normally" be if stored at the more usual 53 degree in 1984.

Variability in temperature, wide ranges between high and low through time, is presumed to have an undesirable effect beyond that of erratic aging. No one is quite sure what that is. That wine is a sturdy stuff fortunately protects it from many of our abuses.

- Wine should be kept in as dark an area as possible. Light, especially direct sunlight, will have a most undesirable effect on color and development. Seeing wine displayed in store windows or constantly under bright lights suggests an unsympathetic feel for wine care, whether this occurs in a store, restaurant or home.

- KEEPING WINE** away from unstable physical surroundings is also desirable. Wine storage areas near heavy motors, machines or earth faults are to be avoided. Frequent agitation doesn't permit sediment to stabilize. There are those who suggest this can cause "nervous" wine; I don't quite know what that would be, however.

- Wine bottles should always be kept on their sides. The simple reason for this is to keep the corks moist and not allow them to dry out, thus permitting air to come into contact with the wine. The simple principle is violated in nearly every quality wine store in the area. (With slow-moving wine, this could be the beginning of trouble for a bottle.)

So, wine stored in a stable, cool, reasonably dark place and kept horizontal should hold up maximally. Violations of any of these conditions will have an effect, depending on their severity and duration.

If you find you cannot adhere to them, better just buy the stuff as you need it.

**HITTING AND SPLITTING**

White has rolled three-two. What would be your suggested play?

Unfortunately, the roll does not allow white to close his bar point (7), 5 point or 3 point. Hitting black on the 11 point with the two roll is a positive step.

White may continue moving the same checker to the 8 point, but that does nothing except overload the 8 point with another checker. Whenever possible, you should avoid "piling" too many checkers on any given point.

White could also bring a checker down from the 12 point to the 10 point, leaving himself with two extra builders in the outer board in hopes of "closing" the 5 point or 7 point. But stripping the 12 point may be a bit premature.

Since black has high hopes of forming a prime (a consistent blockade of

closed points) and possibly blocking in white on the 1 point, white would be best to move up to the 4 point in black's home board.

This move serves two purposes:

- Since black must re-enter the board with half a roll, he may not be able to cover the blot on the 9 point with the other half-roll. Also, barring doubles, black will not be able to hit white on the 4 point unless he slots.
- By moving up to the 4 point, white is putting pressure on the 9 point blot. On the next roll, white may be able to hit black's 9 point checker. Better yet, he will cover his own blot on the 4 point for a sure escape later in the game.
