Massage law OK'd by board

Regulations of massage establishments will take effect next month to alleviate township officials' nightmares of a possible business deterioration.

Board members admit that the ordinance approved Tuesday night was prompted by their concerns of a new business in the Harvard Square Shopping Center.

Charlie's Executive Spa offers exercise equipment and massages to only men. Mike Tremaine, the owner, says the massages are offered only as a relaxation technique.

The ordinance was unanimously approved as an emergency measure which will take immediate effect upon publication.

The law requires the licensing of all massage establishments, and masseuses and masseurs following an investigation by police, fire and health officials. The types of activities al-

lowed in massage establishments is restricted to non-sexual acts.

Violation of the ordinance is a misdemeanor, punishable by a maximum \$500 fine and 90 days in jail.

Despite the board's unanimous approval of the law, several officials criticized the document as poorly written.

Trustee Robert Greenstein, an attorney, acted as devil's advocate and said businesspersons could find loopholes in the law.

The ordinance defines massage establishments as buildings or rooms where massages are offered for pay.

"What happens if an establishment charges for exercise equipment and not massages? The whole ordinance is zip," Greenstein said.

"I'll vote for this. But I warn you that we may be passing an ordinance that could be used as a shield for wrongdoing."

Rules bent a tad for church plans

"It's harder than hell to be against churches," said Clerk John Flodin of the township board's surprise approval of a new church building Tuesday night.

Traditionally tough on new developments, the board voted 5-1 to approve site plans for a new Catholic church despite failure to comply with zoning requirements.

Gary Sands, a parishioner at St. Thomas a'Becket, said the church would have to shelve plans to construct

a building on Lilley, south of Cherry Hill, if parking lot requirements were strictly enforced.

The Rev. Ernest Porcari said the church cannot afford the additional \$60,000 cost of building a second parking lot. The lot is needed to accommodate all those expected at mass and to comply with zoning requirements.

The pastor asked the board to allow "stacked" parking for two years after completion of the church building. Under that arrangement, aisles would not

Treasurer hands over portion of job to deputy

Officially, Jim Donahue will remain treasurer of Canton Township for the next seven months.

In practice, he will share his elective duties with deputy treasurer Maria Falkiewicz.

After returning from a two-week vacation in Florida, Donahue announced Monday that he has definitely decided against resigning.

He had announced last month that he would resign because of an ulcer, an undiagnosed inflammation of the joints and several other health problems.

But Donahue, 32, now says that his resignation would create more problems in the treasurer's office than it would solve.

He plans to perform his legislative duties on the township board and re-

gate his administrative tasks to Mrs. Falkiewicz.

Donahue said he will return a portion of his \$7,500 treasurer's salary to the township.

"I DON'T LIKE it. It doesn't ring right," Donahue of his decision to share his elective duties with Mrs. Falkiewicz.

"But as much as I'd like to say it was

sweet and bow out, I don't think that would be wise.

Donahue's resignation would leave a gaping hole in the treasury department staff, the treasurer and several members of the township board admits.

Deputy treasurer Maria Falkiewicz, who has been shouldering Donahue's administrative duties since last December, would automatically lose her

deputy appointment. She has indicated that she cannot afford to step into the treasurer's shoes for the part-time salary of \$7,500 a year.

Township board members have indicated concern that treasury department operations would be impeded by the appointment of a new treasurer unfamiliar with office operations.

Earlier this month, Mrs. Falkiewicz's salary was boosted from \$135 a week

to \$18,000 annually. Until that action was taken by the township board, the treasury department lacked a full-time supervisor.

The treasurer's job will become a full-time position after next November's election.

"I just felt if I left, I'd put a lot of people in a bad spot," said Donahue. "I don't think that would be a responsible thing to do."

Ford Road options subject of hearing

Proposed alternatives for reconstruction of 1½ miles of M-153 (Ford Road) in Canton Township will be the topic of a public hearing scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Thursday in the township administration building.

The hearing will offer an opportunity for any interested person to state his or her views of the options for the road.

The proposals under consideration include:

- Widening the stretch of road to five lanes with a center lane for left turns and right turn lanes at major intersections, estimated at \$1.2 million;
- Reconstruction and widening to

seven lanes, with the center lane for left turns, estimated at \$1.3 million;

- Reconstruction and widening to a four-lane divided boulevard with back-to-back crossovers for U-turns, estimated at \$2.5 million;
- Provision of low-cost improvements and alternate modes of transportation such as buses.

Each of the reconstruction proposals provide for a sidewalk and bike path combination along Ford Road.

Memories of cleaning up after politics

Few men have had a more unusual start up the political ladder than Joe West, current treasurer of Plymouth Township.

"Would you believe," he said, "that I got my start as a janitor in the old Canton Township hall and eventually landed the job as supervisor?"

It seemed a most unusual start, but Joe quickly recalled that as a janitor he got to know all the people who visited the hall on business and that, on meeting nights, he had to be around.

"So I became well versed in the doings of the township. Little by little I worked up the ladder. It was a slow process, but I got my biggest advancement when I was named to the election board. That put me in good stead with all the officials and my role as the janitor ended."

In those days Joe lived on Cherry Hill Road and Canton Township was just a lot of wide open space.

Finally came the day when he was named the supervisor — a job he had no idea of obtaining when he went to work in the old hall.

"The elder Philip Dingeldey, who was the supervisor, became ill. There was a search on for someone to fill the supervisor's role. Because I knew all the folks and had the insight into the government, I was chosen."

That was back in 1945 and he served two years as the top man in the township.

One of his fondest memories of his days as supervisor was the role he played in mapping plans for Metropolitan Airport. It was the Wayne County Airport then. The big airlines used Willow Run.

"And along with that, I had the chance to watch the start of the swelling population that made Canton Township one of the fastest growing areas in the state."

With a smile, he recalled some of the old days in Canton.

"We had an old wood stove," he said. "That was fine except that we couldn't afford to buy the wood. So I would get up each morning about 4 a.m. and hustle around trying to get enough wood in the area to get the place warmed up for meetings."

Fourteen years ago Joe and his family moved to Plymouth Township. He dropped out of the political arena for a time.

Then, when Elizabeth Holmes retired as Plymouth Township treasurer after years of service, he decided to try a comeback. He ran for the office and was elected.

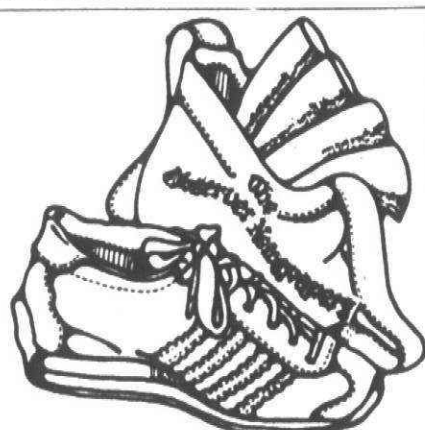
Now, on this time around, he has nice office in the township hall and there no longer is a need to gather wood for a wood stove.

The death penalty, search and seizure, and juvenile justice are among some of the topics to be explored next week at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

The activities will begin on Monday morning and continue through Thursday at Plymouth Canton High.

The series of special discussions on issues relating to the law and justice are being held in observance of Law Week, April 28 to May 2.

The public is invited to any of the sessions.

THE WEEK'S programs will begin at 9:15 a.m. Monday with a discussion on search and seizure led by Stephen Boak.

Boak, a resident of Plymouth Township, works for the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office. His presentation will be held in the auditorium of Canton High.

Census says replies high

Census returns in a district which includes Plymouth were "outstanding," but census workers are already at work door-to-door counting the heads of those who failed to return mailed forms.

Clare Kabel, district manager for the northwest Detroit census office, says returns from the district's 228,000 housing units were about 79 percent or some 187,000, by late last week.

About 225 "enumerators," or door-to-door census workers, began working last week catching up with the remaining 40,000 or so households which failed to respond.

The district is bounded roughly by Eight Mile Road on the north, Dearborn on the south, Wyoming Avenue on the east and the city of Northville on the west.

Included in the district are parts of Detroit and all or most of Dearborn, Westland, Plymouth and Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township, Redford Township and Livonia.

Census workers had estimated the initial return rate from this area at 70 to 75 percent, said Mrs. Kabel.

Census workers will carry red, white and blue identification badges and Privacy Act information sheets when they go knocking on doors.

The next session will be on "Civil and Criminal Cases" led by Mike Pollard, a practicing attorney in the city of Plymouth. Pollard's presentation will begin at 12:10 p.m. and be repeated at 1:05 p.m. Monday in Room 256.

Tuesday will begin with a panel discussion on juvenile justice and status offenders in the auditorium of Canton High, starting at 8:15 a.m.

At 9:15 a.m. attorney Ron Grossman will give a talk on "How to Face Criminal Prosecution" in Room 256. Grossman's talk will be repeated at 10:26 a.m.

At 12:10 p.m. and 1:05 p.m. a discussion on "The Law and Traffic Offenses" will be presented by Judge James Garber of the 35th District Court in Room 256.

Wednesday's activities will begin at 8:15 a.m. in Room 256 with a presentation on Counterpoint by Barb Bergman. Counterpoint is a program for runaways conducted by the Wayne County Youth Services agency.

At 9:15 a.m. Wednesday a debate on the death penalty will be conducted between Harold Simmon of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) and Larry Bunting, an assistant prosecutor for Oakland Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson. The debate will be in the auditorium.

The featured presentation Thursday will be a talk on "Jolt" — a "Scared Straight" type presentation on juvenile delinquents and prison. That session will be presented by Robert Smith starting at 8:15 p.m. in the auditorium.

On all four days, the films "Twelve Angry Men" with Henry Fonda and "Inherit the Wind" with Spencer Tracy will be shown. The films have been made available to students by the 35th District Court.

Faculty members who planned activities for Law Week include Audrey Etienne, Cheryl Elliott, Robert Thams, and Denise Gimpel.

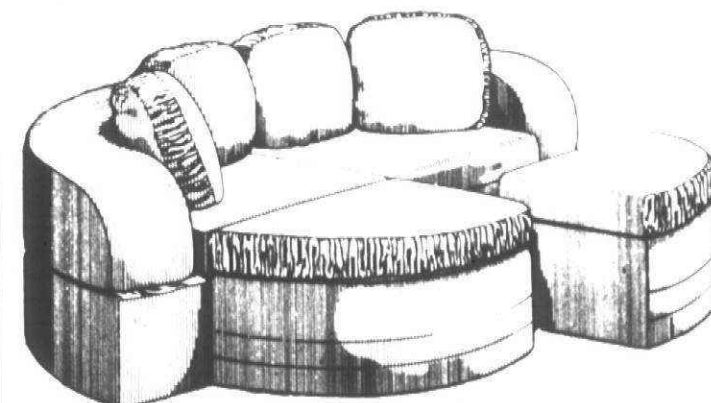

Get some trees—they're free

They call it the great seedling giveaway.

All that's needed is proof of Canton residency and a little time on Saturday in order to take your pick of some free landscape materials.

The giveaway is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. outside township hall at Canton Center and Proctor.

Approximately 7,500 seedlings from the Wayne County Soil Conservation Service will be given to Canton residents free of charge.

"It's probably the greatest thing to happen to Canton every year," Culbert said. "It's just a little bit that you can get back from your tax dollar."

County settles malpractice suit, others pile up

In October 1974, an Inkster man died in Wayne County General Hospital after suffering a head injury at the Detroit Race Course in Livonia.

The County Board of Commissioners recently approved paying the man's wife and her attorney \$350,000 in an out-of-court settlement of their medical malpractice suit filed against the county hospital in Westland.

A doctor there had failed to discover a subdural hematoma — a blood clot under the skull. The man died a day-and-a-half after he had been released from the emergency room.

The case is only the forerunner of other expensive settlements the financially strapped county has yet to face. The most expensive suits involve charges of medical malpractice at the hospital, two suicides in the Wayne County Jail, and other suits regarding conditions at the downtown jail.

"THIS \$350,000 is a drop in the bucket to what you're facing," the county's chief lawyer, George Cross, told a county board committee recently.

"This is the tip of the iceberg. There's more coming."

Cross, a Livonia resident, said in a recent interview that the county faces "\$100 million in outstanding liability" from unsettled cases which have been pending for several years.

He admits the unsettled suits are a potential "time bomb" for the county, which hasn't met its annual budgets since the mid-1970s.

"The time bomb is there," said Cross, "except a chain reaction will never go off . . . not the same day or same year."

Civil cases in Wayne County Circuit Court now take at least three-and-a-half years, if not longer, to come to trial.

The county has already paid nearly \$2 million in unbudgeted funds this year to settle lawsuits. Cost of the settlements could reach \$4 million by Nov. 30, the end of the current fiscal year, Cross said.

"I don't think we paid out \$6 million in my whole 18 years here, period," said Cross.

LAST YEAR, which the county ended with an \$18 million budget deficit, Cross estimates \$1 million was paid to settle claims.

The county is self-insured and car-

ries no medical malpractice coverage for the hospital.

"You take the lumps as they come," said Cross. "No one else pays the bills except you. The county has to decide whether it's going to eat or pay the judgment when the judgment comes."

Cross, who has been a lawyer for nearly 30 years, said there is a "panic situation developing" nationwide among local governments facing increasingly expensive lawsuits. "Every county wants to reduce liability or prevent it," said Cross, who is on the board of directors of the National Association of County Civil Attorneys.

"WE ARE much below the national average as far as payments are concerned," said Cross, but he added the county has yet to face what could be potentially huge settlements.

A nine-year-old police brutality suit filed against both the county and city of Detroit could cost the county \$2.5 million if a mediation panel's award is upheld in a trial or the case isn't settled out of court.

Cross said the county initially won the case by citing the old doctrine of government immunity, but the 1974 Wayne County Circuit Court decision was overturned last year by the Michigan Supreme Court. The high court ordered the case back to trial.

"(Government) immunity is a thing of the past," said Cross. The result: Lawsuits against governments today are quite common.

"There won't be an end to it until there's an end to sue," said Cross.

He says settlement awards now determined by juries have been "excessive." When he started practicing law,

Cross said \$20,000 to \$40,000 settlements in liability cases were considered "exorbitant."

"Now million-dollar verdicts are nickel and dime. They happen all the time."

A CLASS action lawsuit begun in the early 1970s on behalf of Wayne County Jail inmates is still costing the county "a lot of money," Cross said.

The Board of Commissioners recently approved paying the mother of a prisoner who died in June 1972, after being beaten and sexually assaulted by his cell inmates, \$324,300 during the next eight years. The law firm that represented the inmate's mother, Cockrell, Cooper, Spearman & King, of Detroit, will receive \$150,000 by November of 1981.

The jail suit led to establishment of a three-judge circuit court panel to oversee conditions in the jail and maintain a set level of staffing by sheriff's deputies.

Cross said there are 30 suits pending against the sheriff's department, most regarding the jail.

Suits against the hospital and jail cost the most money, but Cross said workers compensation and mental

health cases provide the largest workload for his staff of 16 attorneys.

The county is required to represent the institution or person that seeks to commit a county resident to a state-run mental health hospital.

Cross says he has three attorneys handling 80 mental health cases each (petitions filed to commit a person average 150 a week) and two attorneys handling more than 900 workers compensation cases a year.

"When you have 450 cases," Cross said, "you can't try many. In effect, you're buying 'em out as cheap as you can."

THE "BUY OUT" is one suggestion Cross has for relieving the county's liability burden in smaller damage suits. However, he says his staff lacks time to negotiate with the claimants and their attorneys.

"If we can take the \$2,000, \$3,000 and \$4,000 cases and get rid of them a month after we get them, we would reduce the number of cases."

"But when a guy has 80 cases, it's hard for him to do that. Sometimes it takes the county a week to two months to make the first contact on a loss claim."

Oakwood sponsors fair, free health tests offered

Pregnant women will have an opportunity to hear their infant's heartbeat.

Kids can dress up like a surgeon in shirt, cap and shoes and have their picture taken free.

Everyone will be able to see what a blood cell looks like under the powerful lens of a microscope.

Free screening tests will be available, including blood pressure, diabetes for those over 12 and urinalysis for those over 16. Children will be tested on how well they pronounce words.

Those are just a few of the free tests and services which will be available at the Canton Health Fair. The event is scheduled from noon to 5:30 p.m. this Sunday at Plymouth Canton High School.

The fair is sponsored by Oakwood Hospital of Dearborn, which plans to begin construction of a \$1.5 million ambulatory care center at Canton Center and Warren roads this fall.

The new center, which should be completed by

the fall of 1981, will offer emergency care, maternal and child health services, special clinics and radiology and laboratory services.

"We envision this as an afternoon when every member of the family can learn about their health and have fun doing it," said assistant hospital administrator Marc Gullickson of Sunday's fair.

Refreshments will be served, and a clown will be on hand to entertain.

The Canton Fire Department will demonstrate cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

Several videotape and slide presentations will be shown continually during the fair.

Nearly 20 displays, including an isolette for critically ill newborns, will be staffed by members of the Oakwood Hospital administrative, medical, nursing and professional staffs. Nurses from the Peoples Community Hospital Authority will assist with blood pressure tests.

Pupils get Medals of Merit

only teen-ager to serve on the Canton Recreation Advisory Committee and for his formation and chairmanship of a Canton Youth Advisory Committee.

In addition to her merit medal, Susan will also receive a citation from the Mayflower Post of the VFW.

There were 34 winners in all, who were chosen from a list of 70 nominations in Ford's 15th Congressional District. Asparagus aplenty in Michigan

It's that time of year again when farmers start tilling their fields, planning and planting for another bountiful Michigan harvest. Spring thaws start the beginnings of many new projects in the state where good things are growing.

More than 50 major commercial crops — from apples to zucchini — are produced here each harvest season, making fresh supplies available much of the year for Michigan consumers. Very few states furnish the variety of foods grown in our state.

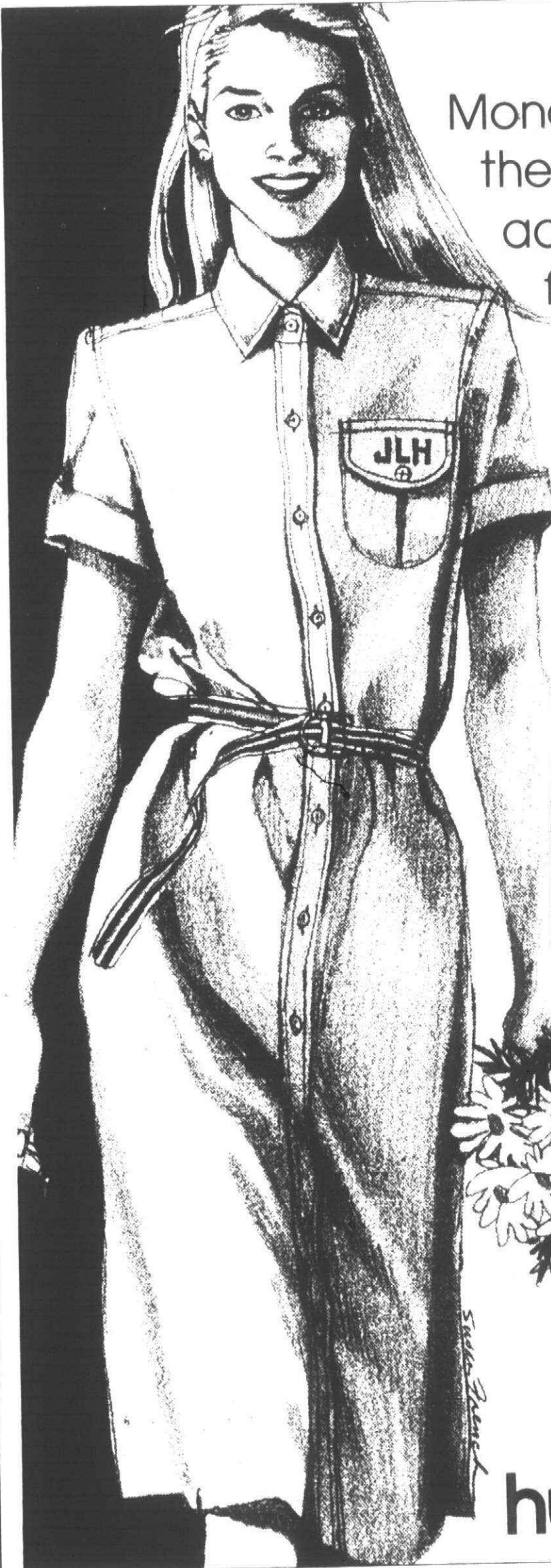
Leading the parade of fresh field vegetables each spring is asparagus — soon to be arriving at markets. Michigan was third in 1979, according to the Michigan Department of Agriculture. About 17,000 acres were planted to

produce the \$13 million crop.

Principal asparagus producing areas are Oceana, Van Buren, Berrien and Cass counties. Fresh Michigan asparagus is plentiful at groceries and farmers' markets around the state, although most of our crop goes to processors.

Asparagus grows for three years in the fields before it is ready for harvest, from late April to mid-June. Like most vegetables, asparagus has good food value, is a good source of vitamin A and iron, and is low in calories, only about 35 per cup when cooked.

When buying fresh asparagus, look for closed, compact tips and smooth green spears. Wash the vegetable thoroughly before using. The stalks may be scrubbed gently with a vegetable brush, if desired.

separate parked cars.
Porcari expects his congregation will be able to afford construction of additional parking spaces after two years.

THE REQUEST placed township board members in a dilemma.
Several members of the township's staff recommended against site plan approval because of the parking problem.

Fire Chief Mel Paulun said the stacked parking arrangement could create problems for firefighters if a car at the church caught fire.
Ordinance director Bruce Phillips

said the parking could create health, welfare and safety problems.
But board members balked at taking a hard line against a church.
Their resolution to approve site

plans for the building included a statement that approval does not establish precedent for other types of developments. Trustee Carol Bodenmiller was the only board member who voted against approval. Treasurer Jim Donahue was absent from the meeting.
"It's my best judgment that the people in the Catholic Church fully know their responsibility to the public," said Flodin.

"Father," he asked, "Can we rely on you each Sunday to say a little prayer on behalf of your parking lot?"

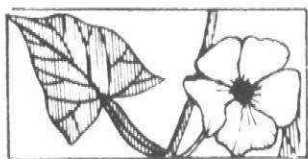
THE BOARD took additional steps to help out the church by waiving the normal \$400 fee for a special use hearing. Special use approval is needed in order to construct a church in a residentially zoned area.
Fire Chief Paulun, who later con-

"This is for your parking lot," he said.

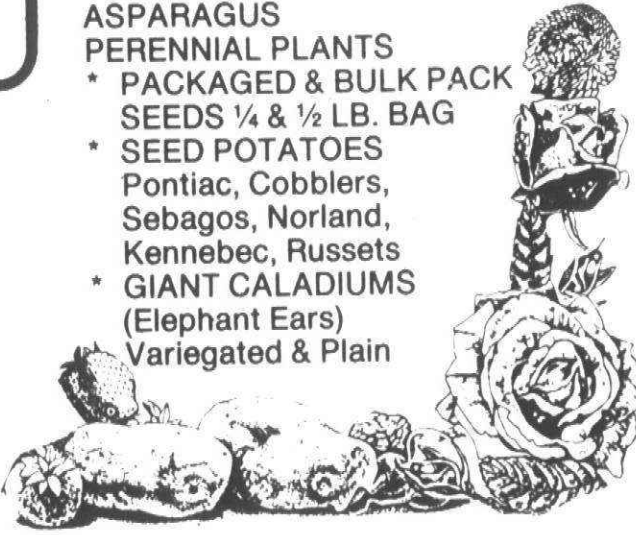

"Kramer vs. Kramer" touched a nerve in filmmakers by depicting so graphically the devastating break-up of a family.

But the film's contemporary plot was betrayed by its win-lose concept following traditional Hollywood — and legal — patterns.

Joint custody, in which parents share equal responsibility and decisions for the welfare of the child, wasn't mentioned or considered by Ted and Joanne Kramer — or their attorneys.

Likewise, when it's parent vs. parent in divorce court in Michigan, combatants soon discover that tradition reigns.

Child custody and support, alimony, visitation and property division is decided by a circuit court judge, with various suggestions from attorneys and

the Friend of the Court, the county agency that oversees the divorces of parents of minors.

Child custody, perhaps the most volatile issue, usually is decided along traditional lines — mothers receive custody, fathers pay child support. Joint custody is seldom granted.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION would change that. One bill in Lansing would make the presumption of custody joint unless one parent proves to be unfit. That proposal has little support from those involved in recommending custody.

Clayton Christenson, Wayne County Friend of the Court, feels that joint custody is feasible if the parents live in the same neighborhood, attend the same

church, and can agree on decisions to be made.

"But, if both parents are that amicable, why are they getting a divorce?" Christenson asked.

"Why did they ever get a divorce if they can agree on these things?" echoed John Houghton, Oakland County Friend of the Court.

He doesn't believe joint custody would solve the problems of fathers who are denied visitation or mothers who aren't receiving child support. And he doubts that many judges would grant joint custody unless the parents' relationship was unusually good.

THE MICHIGAN Women's Commission last year reported in its study, "In the Best Interests of the Child," that only 33 percent of women awarded child support were able to collect on a regular basis.

As one way to improve collections, the Women's Commission recommended that "each order for child support or maintenance payments shall include an order directing a wage assignment of the payer."

The order would not be enforced until arrearage occurs at the level of no support payment within a six-week period or less than 75 percent of the ordered payment within a six-week period.

A committee of the Michigan Legislature is considering a variation on that proposal: automatic wage assignment after 30 days of non-payment. Currently a judge can make a wage assignment in the course of a hearing. The proposed bill would allow the wage assignment to be automatic, at the discretion of the Friend of the Court.

That proposal has its fans and its critics.

A "terribly ignorant attempt on the part of Sen. (Kerry) Kammer (sponsor of the bill)," according to Alan Lebow, member of a group pushing equal rights for fathers.

A "very effective tool," according to Christenson. But the Wayne County official believes the legislation should have adequate safeguards.

"The rights of the father should be protected. If he does become delinquent, he should have the opportunity to appear in court and purge himself of that contempt."

The bill "would go a long way to remove a lot of the collection problems Friend of the Court is handling," in Oakland County, according to Houghton.

Currently, the Friend of the Court Association is attempting to come up with a substitute bill that would be simpler, Houghton said.

David Chambers, in his book "Mak-



ing Fathers Pay," also recommends wage assignments on a national basis as one way to enforce child support collections. But he also believes the system has its problems.

"Even if we shifted to a more bloodless, automated system of wage deductions, we are still fixing for men and women the terms of their relationship well after their lives have settled into other patterns."

THE DEMANDS created by a high divorce rate and a changing society are receiving attention elsewhere.

A first step in bringing uniformity to the Friend of the Court system may be proposed legislation for a state court administrator, who would also appoint the Family Advocates, the proposed new name for Friends of the Court, now appointed by the governor.

The administrator also would take complaints via a toll-free phone number and report the complaints to the various county agencies.

If the proposed law is adopted, it would be the first time the individual county Friends of the Court would report to a state agency. Currently, budgets, appointments, with the approval of the governor, and review are determined by county commissioners.

Those proposed laws, however, will scarcely affect judges, who have the fi-

nal say on the crucial matters of divorce. The diverse and conflicting judgments rendered are testimony to the lack of uniformity among judges and the Friends of the Court.

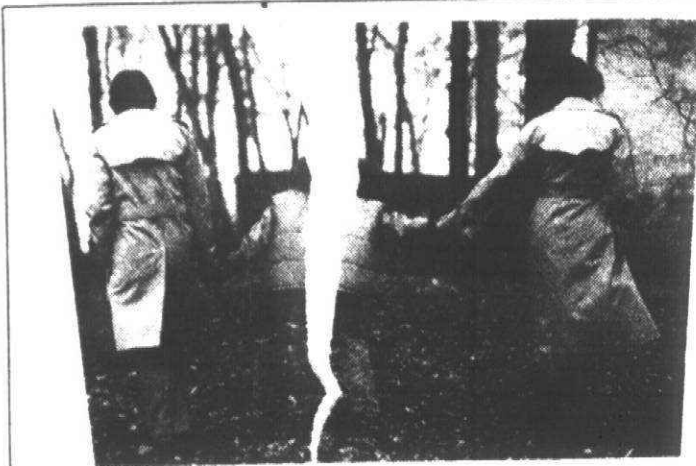
"The judges should be required to put into the record their reasons for granting custody to parent A and not parent B, not in general terms, but very specifically, so that they can be held accountable for their decisions," one father wrote to the Michigan Women's Commission.

There are no statistics to indicate how often judges deviate from the recommendations of Friend of the Court. But it's a rare divorce where Friend of the Court is not involved.

In Oakland County, some judges will agree, though reluctantly, to allow the parents to set up their own system of support payments and avoid Friend of the Court.

Even if the divorce spiral wanes, one administrator believes the courts will be forced to cope with more of the backwash of separating families.

"Unless there's a reversal of the population movement back into urban areas... I see that we are going to be dealing with problems of poorer people without sufficient funds to engage an attorney, to appeal in court, file petitions on their behalf," predicts Christenson.

'The Best Interests of the Child'

Last year the Michigan's Women Commission completed a comprehensive study of the Friend of the Court. The purpose of the study was "to examine the operation of the Friend of the Court system in light of the duties and responsibilities outlined by statute and court rules."

Based on the study that included six public hearings throughout the state, the commission made numerous recommendations for statutory and procedural changes outlined in the 73-page report, "In the Best Interests of the Child."

Those recommendations included:

- Elimination of gender-based bias in statute and court rules.
- State funding and control of the Friend of the Court, including 100 percent reimbursement of federal revenues generated by agency.
- Establishment of a State Administration Office with a toll-free telephone number.
- Responsibilities of the state administrator would include development of uniform standards of conduct, systems and procedures for the Friend of the Court offices, including a uniform child support schedule; handbook; grievance procedure, training and certifying of personnel; staff/caseload ratios and uniform hours of operation.
- Numerous changes in statute to regulate Friend of the Court appointments, including change in statute to require job performance review of all Friends of the Court.

- Responsibility to function in the best interest of the child, rather than either divorcing or separating party.
- Use of a referee system, including training of referees.
- Referral to the Child Protection Agency of any complaints of child abuse or neglect.
- Provision that any information made available to the circuit judge or judges shall be available to the attorney or attorneys of record.
- Provision for a self-starting automatic review and enforcement system, including review of all support orders at least once every two years.
- Enforcement of all visitation rights, medical, dental and hospital and pharmaceutical expenses.
- Elimination of review of the custodial home.
- Review and enforcement of all alimony provisions.
- Thorough investigation in all disputed custody cases, including justification of the Friend of the Court recommendation.
- Uniform enforcement of visitation rights, including jailing as a penalty for non-compliance of court-ordered visitation.
- Determination of sufficient child support based on verified income of both parents and verified expenses.
- Prohibition of the deduction of fees from child support.
- Provision for wage assignment in the order for child support, effective in the case of arrearages.

Tax break: A savings in garbage payments?

To tax or not to tax.

Everyone's looking for a tax break these days and occasionally the subject of a tax savings turns to garbage.

In a recent survey of township residents several advocated that Plymouth Township tax them for refuse pick-up so that they in turn could claim the added property tax as a greater deduction on their federal and state income taxes.

According to Supervisor Thomas Notebaert, this change has been discussed

by local officials but he doubts it would have much impact.

Presently, taxpayers here pay five separate contractors for this service; four work in residential areas and one works exclusively in commercial pick-up.

The fees for residents range from \$60-\$84 annually, according to Treasurer Joe West.

One township resident of the Glenview Subdivision wrote:

"It would be more beneficial if the garbage collection and snow removal

were made a part of our township services so that the money we pay for these services could become a tax-deductible item."

Both Notebaert and township auditor Henry Salla have differing viewpoints on the benefit of such a tax to residents.

"THAT WOULD be true," Salla says. "If it's part of the property tax bill, then it would be deductible as an itemized deduction for virtually all prop-

erty owners-dwellers."

"The problem is it would require a vote of the people to raise the millage."

Salla estimates that a resident presently paying \$72 directly for the garbage collection service could receive about a \$24 tax deduction if his or her service was included in the property tax levy.

Plymouth Township presently levies 4.9 mills for its operation, 1.9 of which is for debt retirement.

"It might also be possible to get a

better rate per household if several companies bid on it," Salla adds in reference to the township taking over the contracting business.

Notebaert, on the other hand, maintains that the present system is "the least expensive way to go."

"Whether it would be much benefit is debatable."

He says a mill levy for such a service would result in inequities among various subdivisions where assessments vary.

"The guy living in Beacon Hills would be paying more than the guy liv-

ing in Greenmeadows because assessments are higher in Beacon Hills."

"None of the present contractors working in Plymouth Township would be capable of doing the whole township," he adds. "And I know people don't want any more taxes."

"The city of Plymouth certainly hasn't shown it's a better deal."

In Plymouth, one private contractor collects residential and commercial rubbish and will charge about \$193,000 in the next fiscal year (1½ mills). On a home assessed at \$30,000, that charge would amount to about \$45 annually.

CEP will host band festival

Eight bands and six orchestras from 11 Southeastern Michigan high schools will converge at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) Saturday to take part in the Michigan High School Band and Orchestra Association (MHSBOA) sponsored state band festival.

Out of the 14 ensembles entered in the festival that earned the right to perform in the state festival by receiving first division ratings at the district festivals in March, the CEP will be represented by the Concert Band and the Symphony Band.

Acting as the host school, members of the two bands will not only be responsible for its musical performances but also for greeting visiting schools and acting as guides throughout the day.

Bands involved in the festival are required to perform three selections (a march, a required number and a selected piece) that have been prepared in

advance for three adjudicators.

From the concert performance groups move to a different area of the festival and are required to play two pieces (a march and a concert number) for one judge after being given seven minutes to look over the music. This part of the festival is known as sight reading.

A final rating is given to each band or orchestra by averaging the four judges' scores together. Ratings are given between one and five with one being considered superior.

Adjudicators Saturday include: Dr. William D. Revelli, director emeritus at the University of Michigan; Cornelius VanDerPuy, music coordinator of the Grand Rapids Christian Schools; Joe Parker from Asbury College and Harold Geerdes, associate professor of music in Grand Rapids.

The CEP Concert Band, under the direction of Carl Battishill, will be the

opening band of the day. Scheduled to perform at 8 a.m. the band's selections will include the "March" from "First Suite in E-Flat" by Holst, "Chester" by Schumann and "Emperata Overture" by Smith.

Battishill and the concert band are entered as a Class A band in the festival. The symphony band will participate in the class AAA division as in past years.

On the symphony band's program will be "Flores de Espana" by Choví and arranged for band by Edmundson, "Variations on a Medieval Tune" by Delo Joio and "Do Not Go Unto the Night" by Del Bargo.

The symphony band is scheduled to play at 4:10 p.m. and is under the direction of James R. Griffith.

Concert performances will be presented in the Plymouth Salem auditorium and the sight reading portion of the festival will be held in the Salem gym.

All groups are given ample warm-up time and the Salem band room will be utilized for this purpose.

Throughout the festival musicians, parents and spectators will have concessions made available to them by the Plymouth Band Boosters Club. Jerry Hotchkins, president of the Boosters, is in charge of the concessions and will be aided by parents of CEP band members.

Besides the CEP Concert and Symphony Bands other performing bands include East Lansing, Jackson Parkside, Okemos and Jackson Northwest in Class A and East Detroit and Warren Cousino in class AAA.

Those schools with orchestras participating in the state festival are Hillsdale (Class B), East Lansing, Jackson Parkside and Clawson in Class A, Lakeview in class AA and Wayne Memorial in Class AAA.

Admission to the festival is free.

West Middle staff didn't lead the fight

Editor: After reading your March 31 front page article in the Plymouth Observer relating to the defeat of the ballot issues, it appears some clarification of the role played by the West Middle School staff is in order.

You are correct when you say that the West staff is interested in maintaining middle schools, but your article implied that the staff was "leading the fight" for the passage of Proposal II. This was not the case, even though we understood that the retention of the middle schools depended upon the passage of both Proposals I and II.

From the beginning, we saw Proposal II as being unacceptable to our parents and to ourselves. We did not see the vote on this proposal as a referendum on whether the community wished to have grade re-alignment or not.

The issue seemed to be as to whether the building of any additional rooms at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) was advisable. Many parents have expressed their anxiety about sending their students to the CEP as they perceive the conditions as something less than desirable, partly because of some of the present publicity on the vandalism. These parents are looking for an alternative to the CEP.

It is the contention of the West staff that the middle schools can be maintained for at least the next five years without the expenditures called for in Proposal II. Central Middle School could serve as a high school facility and provide the option for those who would prefer a smaller setting.

With the slowdown in building, the projected enrollments are not likely to materialize but even if they do, they could be managed with most buildings at capacity during the fifth year. Another plan would then need to be in hand at the end of the fifth year.

The money in Proposal I should be adequate for providing a sound building at Central.

Before being changed to a middle school, Central housed nearly 1,900 students as a high school but it would not be necessary to approach that number to give the CEP the necessary relief.

There are many other advantages to maintaining the present grade alignment that could be noted:

- The cost of providing the necessary labs, equipment and furniture for ninth grade programs in five junior high schools could well be more expensive than readying Central for a high school.
- The cost of placing five elementary schools on Extended School Year (ESY) could well exceed the costs of having

one or even two additional middle schools on ESY.

• Present programs can be maintained for sixth and ninth graders which would allow students to move ahead to the next level in the various sequences through the 12th grade.

We feel grade re-alignment is a step backward, when the number of middle schools is growing across the country. Plymouth-Canton middle schools have been among the leaders. We wish to be able to continue to improve our middle school and continue to show others the way.

We do hope that the board of education will continue to support the present grade alignment. It can be done without the extras in Proposal II. We are pledged to see that we have truly outstanding middle schools in our community, but it cannot be done with grade re-alignment and a return to the old junior highs.

We would appreciate the publishing of this letter so the misunderstanding in your article can be corrected. Thanks.

Who offers service?

Editor:

I read with great interest your most recent article on April 17 regarding the opinion poll that was taken on existing services in Plymouth Township.

I have been a resident of Plymouth Township for the past 11 years and live in the Glenview subdivision. I am at a loss to understand the results of the opinion poll taken on existing services which states that 62.8 percent of the residents surveyed were satisfied with the garbage collection services provided by Plymouth Township and 42 percent of the residents were satisfied with the snow removal services provided and 51.3 percent of the residents were satisfied with the police protection provided as an existing service.

The reason I say I am at a loss to understand these figures is because to the best of my knowledge, up to the present time, we have had no police protection outside of the minimal services of the Wayne County Sheriff Department.

which is paid for by the residents of this subdivision and we have had no garbage collection as a service provided by the township except for the garbage collection that is paid for by the residents at the rate of \$72 per year over and above their taxes.

This \$72 is paid for out of the pocket of each family living in the Glenview subdivision. It is not a part of their property tax and is therefore not subject to the state or federal property tax deduction for income tax purposes.

If I sound bitter about this article, I am. I am bitter because I think it is very misleading and I think it is about time that someone speaks out about the lack of services in Plymouth Township for which we are paying substantial property taxes.

In my opinion, it would be more beneficial if the garbage collection and snow removal were made a part of our township services so that the money we pay for these services could become a tax deductible item.

We have had no snow removal in the Glenview subdivision out side of that

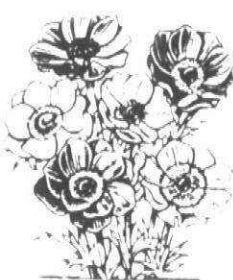

If he can't fulfill job, treasurer should resign

It appears that Jim Donahue is taking the citizens of Canton for a ride.

He was elected in November 1978 to assume the duties of treasurer, which include administrative tasks inside township hall and legislative functions on the township board.

He has neglected both areas of responsibility for months because of health problems.

Donahue cannot be faulted for poor health. But he can be faulted for shirking his obligation to resign from an office which he cannot handle.

DONAHUE ANNOUNCED that he would resign last month, but changed his mind because of staffing problems in the treasurer's department.

The problem revolves around deputy treasurer Maria Falkiewicz, who has been shouldering all of Donahue's administrative duties for months.

Mrs. Falkiewicz would make an excellent treasurer and replacement for Donahue.

But she has indicated that she cannot afford to step into the treasurer's position for \$7,500 annually. She makes \$18,000 a year as deputy treasurer and department supervisor under recent township

board action. Her deputy appointment would automatically terminate with Donahue's resignation.

Township officials would hate to lose Mrs. Falkiewicz, and we concur.

But Donahue's idea for keeping Mrs. Falkiewicz on board is shortchanging the voters of Canton as well as township officials and employees.

He announced Monday that he would stay on board as treasurer and continue relegating his administrative duties to Mrs. Falkiewicz. He would serve as a legislator on the Canton board and return a portion of his salary to the township.

BUT DONAHUE is not even carrying out his pledge to sit on the township board.

He missed another meeting Tuesday night.

The voters of Canton deserve better than that. They did not elect a treasurer to pan Tuesday's television offerings.

Donahue should resign immediately. Mrs. Falkiewicz and the township board have been carrying the ball without him for months.

The treasurer's dead weight is impeding their ability to figure out some solution to the treasurer's department problems.

Busing vs. integration

It's back. Or I should say it has resurfaced — many persons just thought it went away.

Last week we learned the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) will file suit in District Federal Court in Detroit asking for a metropolitan desegregation plan — busing.

You remember the busing controversy.

Recall the images of hysterical mobs badgering suburban school boards into submission; Irene McCabe walking to Washington D.C.; Federal Judge Stephen Roth; white flight; and lawyers hauling in the big bucks from school districts fighting for the supremacy of neighborhood schools.

Well, about the only things which have changed are that Roth is dead and Mrs. McCabe has been all but relegated to the newspaper clipping files.

OH YES, THERE IS one other thing — the Detroit metropolitan area still is without significant integration.

What a shame it is that we haven't learned from our past mistakes, that we haven't taken advantage of the time since 1974 to properly integrate our communities so the need for another busing fight would be unnecessary.

Many suburban school superintendents are confident that the NAACP will never be able to prove their district "deliberately" discriminated.

They could be correct. They could just as easily be wrong. But even if the suburban school districts win this round, the problem will exist still.

WHEN THE NAACP does file, this metropolitan area will explode and the concussion will rent the moral fiber of every community involved.

All the old hatred, fears and prejudices will resurface. Wasted will be millions of dollars and thousands of hours to fight busing. They will be dollars and hours which could be used for far nobler pursuits.

It will happen only because we didn't integrate.

Busing only is a symptom. Integration, or the lack of it, is really the issue.

We all want our children to attend the school down the street. In the long run that is what the NAACP is aiming for.

Forced with the prospect of loading children on a bus and sending them miles away should make clear thinking persons realize that racial integration is a far better alternative.

But when talk comes of integration, few are clear-thinking.

Don't kid yourself. Busing really has nothing to do with improving education, the dangers of riding a bus to school or student inability to participate in after-school activities.

WHAT IT DOES have to do with is the premise that the world is a mentally healthier place to exist if black and white children live in the same neighborhoods and go to the same schools.

Most suburbs haven't reached out, haven't welcomed black brothers and sisters into their communities.

So the NAACP has bided its time and will once again show us the absurdity of burying our heads in the sands of white ghettos.

Once again, we will have the hysterical mobs, the lawyers making the big bucks and children suffering just because the suburbs turned their heads on integration.

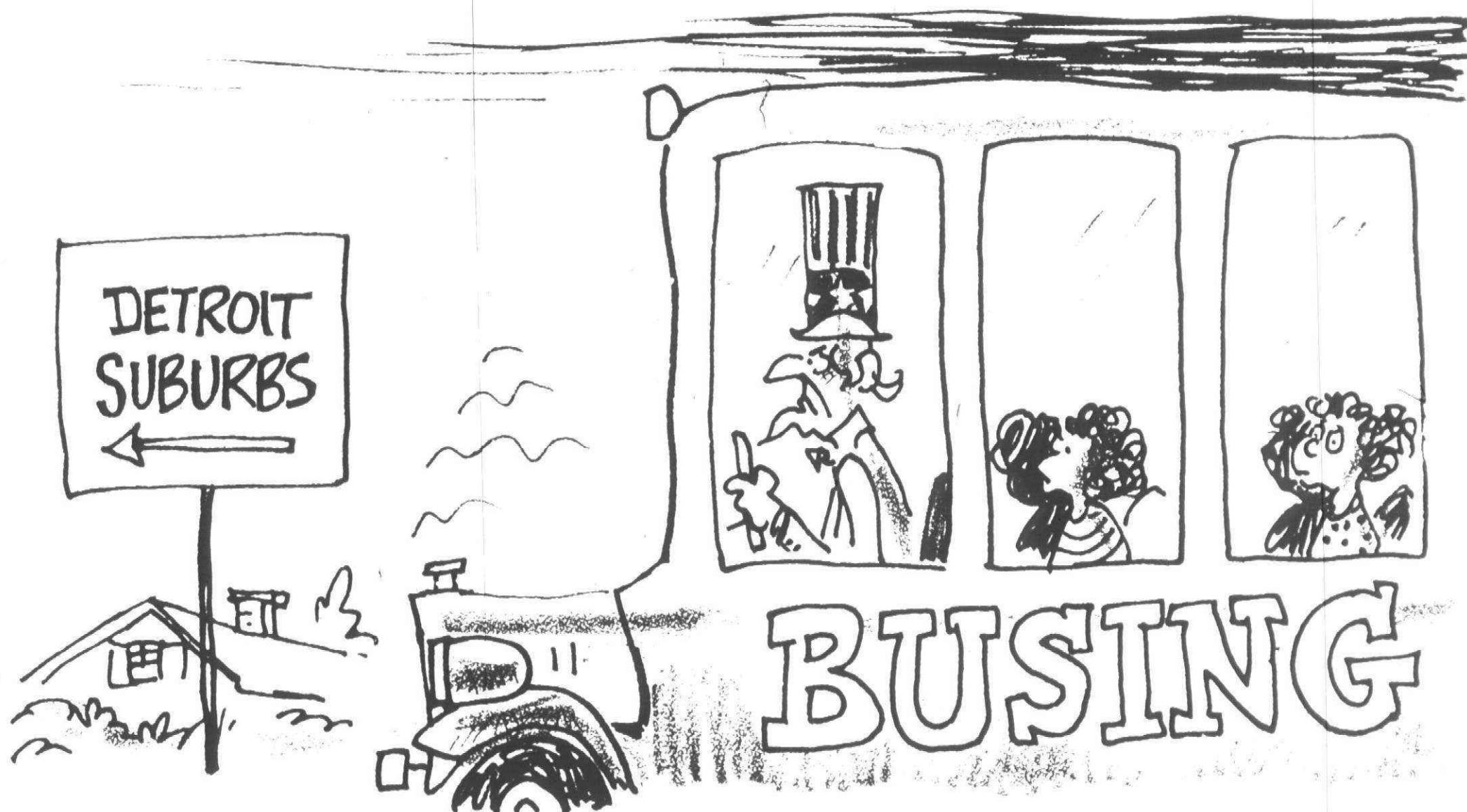

Did you know that much of Michigan's rural road and bridge system was developed in the early 1900s to meet traffic needs of that era? Today's larger farms requiring larger equipment encounter real mobility problems on roads where bridges are less than 18 feet wide.

Property tax, nay; sales tax, yea?

"Polls show us," Lt. Gov. James Brickley was telling us the other day, "the property tax is the most unpopular form of taxation in Michigan."

"The next most unpopular is the income tax."

"The form of taxation with the most acceptance is the sales tax."

That is the tone of things in the State Capitol Building. Pick up any newspaper in Michigan during the last month, and there will be page one stories about squawks over rising assessments, residential taxes that are rising faster than industrial taxes, and screams for property tax relief.

The Powers That Be in Lansing, as Brickley indicated, are thinking in terms of cutting the property tax burden by something like \$500 on an average house.

And the top candidate to replace the lost revenue is the sales tax. Now an even 4 percent, it may be raised to 5.5 percent if voters are willing.

And the voters may be willing.

WHAT MICHIGAN voters will accept flies in the face of conventional economic wisdom.

My college public finance text, typical of the conventional wisdom, argued that the sales tax is "regressive" — that it takes a larger proportion of low incomes than of high incomes.

That's because high income folks supposedly save higher shares of their incomes while low-income

folks must use the bulk of their incomes for consumption and save little.

The conventional wisdom holds that the income tax is fairer — even at a flat rate — because it falls on spending and saving with equal force. "All taxes are eventually paid out of income," we were taught and taught and taught.

If a flat rate income tax was fair, a graduated rate income tax was even fairer, so the conventional economic wisdom went.

Organized labor and the Democrats tried three times in the last 15 or so years to sell the conventional economic wisdom. The voters said "no sale."

MY COLLEGE text was "The Economics of Public Finance" by Prof. Philip E. Taylor of the University of Connecticut.

It was written in 1953, and if that seems ancient,

guess again. Taylor wrote more than a quarter-century ago on page 409:

"The groups principally agitating for sales taxes during the '30s were those who stood to gain from a lightening of the property tax burden. Specifically, farmers and real estate interests were enthusiastic for the sales tax."

So what is California's Howard Jarvis? A developer and landlord, as I recall. And what is Michigan's Robert Tisch, besides being a drain commissioner who is in contact with farmers? He's also a farmer.

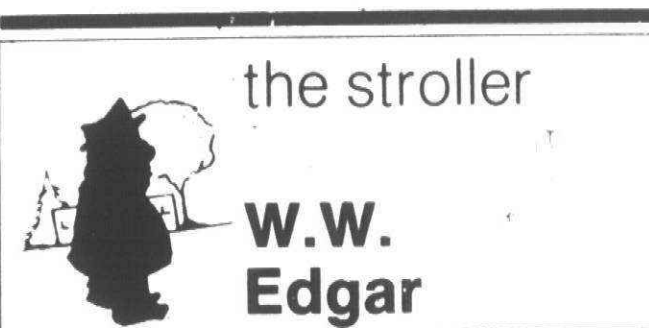
This is not to imply they favor higher sales taxes, though it explains their aversion to property taxes.

MICHIGAN VOTERS are pretty independent. They split their tickets all over the map and are pretty choosy about which propositions they support.

So it will be fascinating to see what lands on the ballot in November and what the voters do. Another Tisch tax cutting proposal is likely to be there. The Powers That Be in Lansing are likely to have a tax shift proposal to cut property taxes and raise the sales tax.

If voters buy the establishment's proposal, as Brickley and the polls predict, then conventional economic wisdom will deserve to be rewritten.

Press box view: dollar shrinking



Take the case of Nolan Ryan, the Houston pitcher, who demanded — and got — a contract calling for more than \$1 million a year. And just imagine, he pitches, at the most, only every fourth day.

When you compare these salaries with what the stars of yesteryear received, you can realize just how much the dollar has shrunk.

While no official figures ever were published, it is said that Ty Cobb, rated the best ball player who ever lived, got only \$17,000 and he managed the Tigers while playing.

Then there was Babe Ruth, one of the greatest drawing cards of all time, whose announced salary of \$80,000 a year at his peak brought large headlines in newspapers and magazines around the world.

BALL PLAYERS ALONE are not the symbols. Take a look at the fight game these days and compare the purses with what Joe Louis received and there is every reason for some eyebrow lifting.

During his entire career, which spanned 14 years, The Brown Bomber received little more than \$5 million. Today, Mohammed Ali wants more than that for a single appearance. What's more, he has been getting it.

Then there is Tommy Hearns, the Detroit welterweight who has been fighting only a short time, now getting — or asking — for \$300,000 for his next bout.

The sports field is not the only place to look for symbols of the shrinking dollar.

Back in 1914 Henry Ford caused a sensation around the world when he offered \$5 a day for employment in the Ford plant. Workers came here from all parts of the world, for that \$5 a day looked like a fortune.

Now the hourly rate for many of these jobs has passed \$10 and still the workers aren't satisfied.

But their wages are never published. In contrast, the money paid the athletes is spread over the nation's sports pages. So they are the real symbols of how far the dollar has shrunk.

And it has been quite a shrinking.

Backlighting makes effect dramatic

How many times have you been ready to take a picture only to find yourself inadvertently moving your position to get the sun blasting directly into the subject?

Unfortunately, many photographers are under the false impression that full, frontal lighting is a must and that they are obligated to take advantage of every light ray available.

How many pictures have you seen (or taken) of squinty-eyed people with harsh shadows in their faces? A photographer has a lot of nerve to place someone in direct sunlight and then ask them not to squint.

FULL FRONTAL lighting is, of course, not mandatory. On the contrary, doing a reverse — a complete 180-degree reverse — and placing the sun directly behind the subject can give pleasing and often dramatic results.

Backlighting creates a bright edge or rim around the subject. It tends to separate it from the background. Backlighting, especially when shining through a soft mist or filtering through trees, will produce sparkling and translucent results.

Remember, it is essential to shield the lens from the direct rays of the sun. If you don't, internal reflections and glare may be recorded on the film. Using a lens hood or shading the lens with your hand will solve this potential problem.

WHEN PHOTOGRAPHING people using backlighting, you must pay special attention to exposure. A bright background will tend to trick the camera and you'll underexpose the picture, getting too dark a subject.

To overcome this, move in close to your subject. Take a meter reading and then move back to your original camera position using close-up reading for your exposure.

Remember, too, that "fill-in" flash will add sparkle and life to your subject's face while still maintaining all of the advantages of backlighting.

Proper exposure for using "fill-in" flash is easy to obtain. Double the guide number of your flash unit and divide this number by the pre-determined f-stop of the scene to be photographed.

Make sure the shutter speed permits flash synchronization. The answer will be the number of feet you should place yourself from the subject to get a pleasing "fill-in" effect.

EXCITING PICTURES can be obtained by intentionally under-exposing people in a backlit situation.

By taking the exposure reading off the sky just before a sunset or just after a sunrise, foreground subjects will be underexposed to the point that they will appear as silhouettes. The results will be dramatic and add tremendous impact to your pictures.

Sunsets and sunrises in themselves make for some of the most striking photographs. These obvi-

ously are backlit pictures. Include the sun right in our picture when it's a giant "fireball" just ready to slip beneath the horizon.

Meter readings should be taken off the bright area of the sky next to the sun.

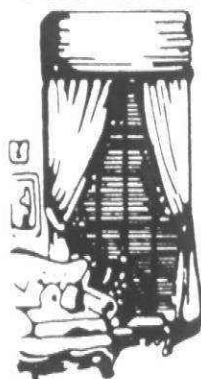
A WORD OF CAUTION: To protect your eyes, never look directly at the sun through your camera until just before a sunset and then only for a brief

period. At this time of day most of the damaging rays of the sun are eliminated.

So light up your photographic growth — with backlighting!

On Friday, May 2, at 8:30 a.m. more than 1,200 Special Olympians will converge at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) stadium to kick off the track and field events and swimming competition.

The Parade of Athletes will be led into the stadium by the CEP Bands under the direction of James R. Griffith. Prominent community leaders, representing education and local governmental units, and other special guests, will lend their presence and support during the Presentation of the Colors, the official welcome, the lighting of the Olympic Torch, and the official start of the games.

Included in the program are running events, high jump, long jump, softball throw, Frisbee throw, blind runners event, wheel chair race, and the Pen-

tathlon. The swimming competition will occur in the Salem High School pool complex.

The Special Olympics program has been national in scope for several years, and as of the summer of 1979, international dimensions were achieved with the staging of the 1st International Summer Special Olympics in Brockport, N.Y. The International Games are funded by the Kennedy Foundation and other philanthropic and service organizations like Civitan International. Michigan Civitans are proud to say that we have been in the forefront of Special Olympics support since its inception.

Beyond this reminder of a forthcoming event, however, is a sincere and direct appeal to all readers. Our Special Olympics family needs you. They need you to know that they exist and are basically much more like the so-called "normal" individual than they are different.



Plymouth Canton blasts Mustangs in league opener

Plymouth Canton made a smashing Western Six League baseball debut Monday afternoon by trouncing Northville, 18-6.

The Chiefs collected 15 hits to drop the Mustangs from the unbeaten ranks. Canton is now 2-4 overall.

Meanwhile, Northville played sloppy in their first defeat, much to the dismay of coach Dick Kucher.

"We weren't mentally ready," he said. "Pitching and defense had been no problem until today. We even threw to the wrong base."

"Usually when you score six runs you should win. We swung the bat well. I'm just really disappointed."

Canton rocked Northville starter John Hale for five runs in the second inning. Singles by Meador and center fielder Keith Stone accounted for four runs.

Northville cut the lead to two with three runs in the bottom of the third.

CANTON came back in the bottom of the inning with three runs of its own.

Catcher Frank McMurray, who also collected three hits, started the inning with a single. Two Northville errors led to two Canton runs.

Northville collected a run in the fourth and two more in the fifth on a tape-measure homer by first baseman Paul Luiki.

Canton, however, struck for 10 more

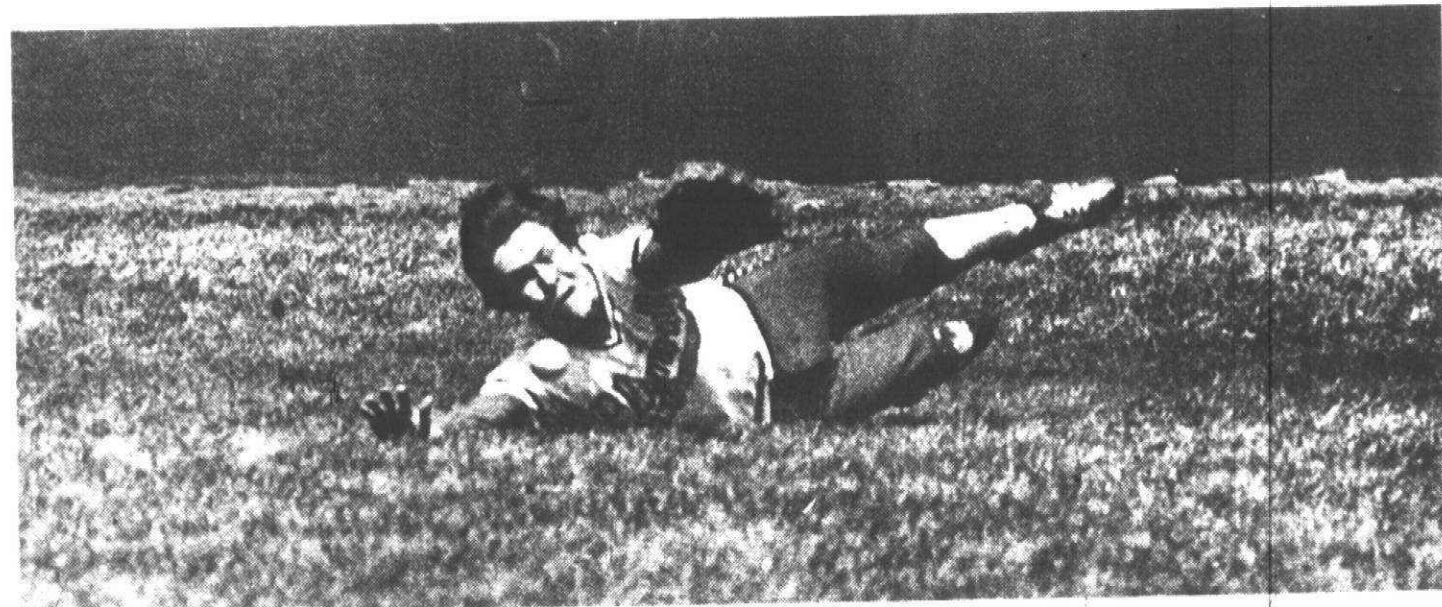
"We played the way we're capable of," he said. "We are a better staff than we showed down in Cincinnati."

He is fully recovered now and proved that Saturday in leading the Blue squad to a 35-7 victory over the White team in the annual spring game.

HEWLETT CONNECTED on eight of 17 passes that netted 105 yards and two touchdowns. He threw a nice 25-yard end zone toss to speedster Anthony Carter in the third quarter.

The Plymouth signal caller also was effective carrying the football. He ran for 54 yards in 12 carries and proved he was adept at running the option.

While he completed eight passes, Hewlett missed several others just by inches. On two occasions the ball slipped off the finger tips of intended receivers.

And how did Hewlett rate his performance?

"In the first half I was kind of tense," he said. "In the second half the team kind of relaxed more. I felt a lot more comfortable."

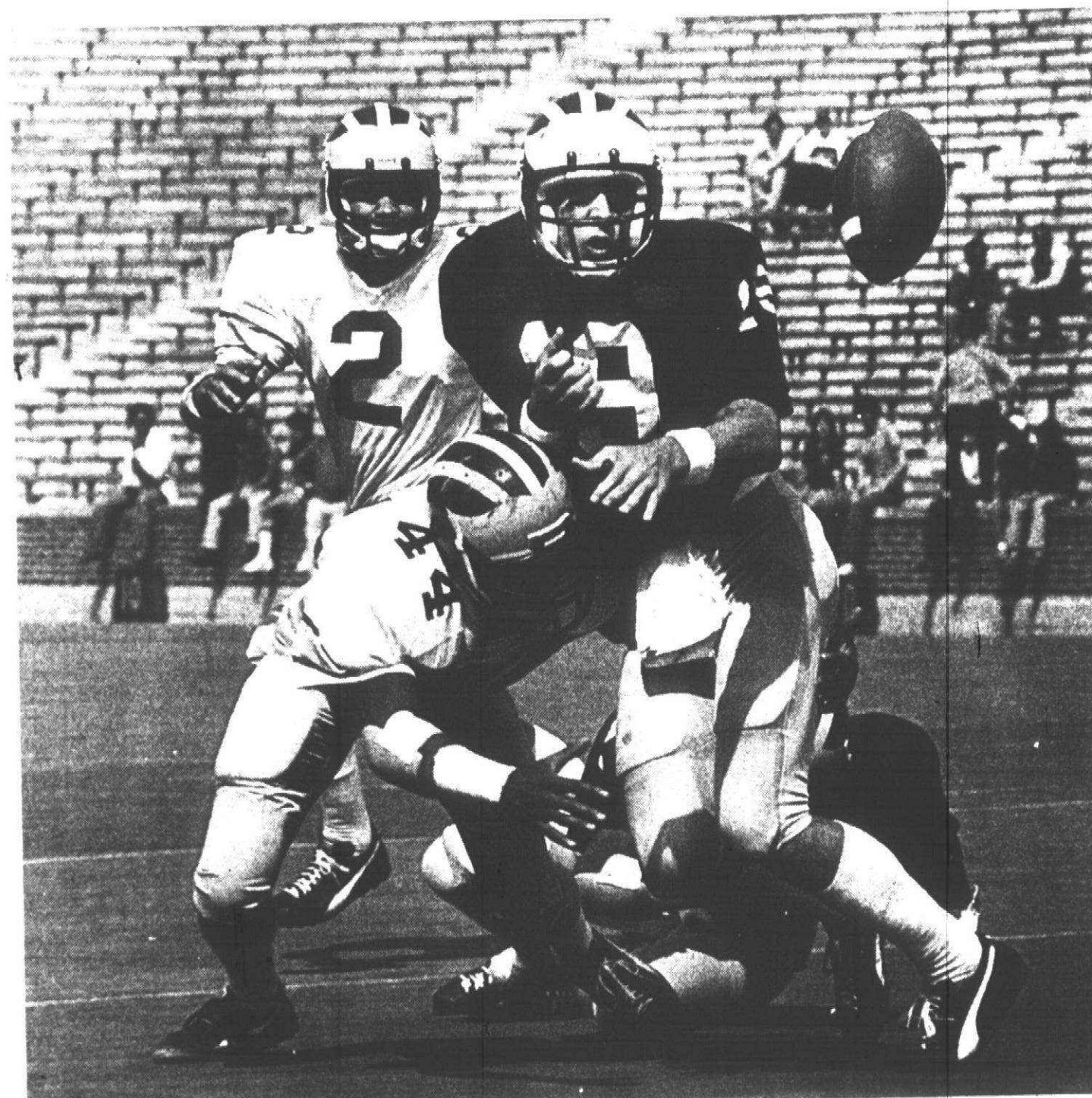
The 6-1, 195-pounder drove the Blues to three touchdowns in the second half. He was much more accurate in the final two quarters with his throwing.

"I had as much contact during practice as anybody else," said the soft-spoken Hewlett. "I worked on throwing under pressure and a lot on the passing game."

John Wangler, who started several games for the Wolverines last fall, did not participate in the spring game because he is recovering from a knee injury.

HE COULD be right back in the picture if the knee mends in time for fall drills.

But according to Lund and Schembechler, Hewlett is the No. 1 quarterback until someone else beats him out.

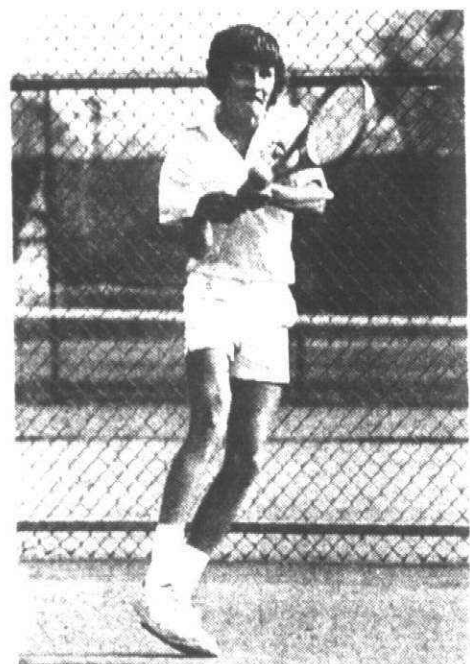

The loss dropped Bentley to 1-1 in the league.

With the hue and cry that bowling costs too much, many bowlers are considering cutting down on their participation next season. At least that is the murmur heard along the approaches these days when the layoffs in the factories continue at a rapid rate.

This is disturbing to the proprietors for the simple reason that the bowlers themselves make the cost of league bowling too high. During the past season, for example, many of the leagues charged \$6. But less than half of that went to the proprietor. He charged only 90 cents a line. The rest of the \$6 went for prize money and the money paid to the league secretary.

The high rate charged by the league was to meet the demand of the bowler for larger prize lists. If they want large prize lists, that's up to them, but the proprietor should not be blamed for it.

Instead of being too costly, bowling now is about the cheapest form of recreation. Bowling three lines over a 2½-hour period in a league means a cost of \$2.70. You can't go to a movie for that price, let alone any of the major sports events.

THERE WAS a time when a 700 series was a rarity. Now they are becoming commonplace and one need look no further than Westland Bowl for proof.

Several times during the season five barrier breakers were rolled on one shift in the Little Caesar Classic. But last week this number jumped to seven.

MADELYN DONEHUE made the most of her 30-pin "spot" to take top honors in the Livonia Ladies classic. She won the third game with 213-30-

243 and that helped her take the series with 557-90-647. In the other games Joan Lewis won the first with 184-26-210 and Doris Macorkindale took the second with 213-30-233.

IN OTHER good performances Craig Demjeo, a 17-year-old, posted a 635 in the senior house league at Woodland Lanes. 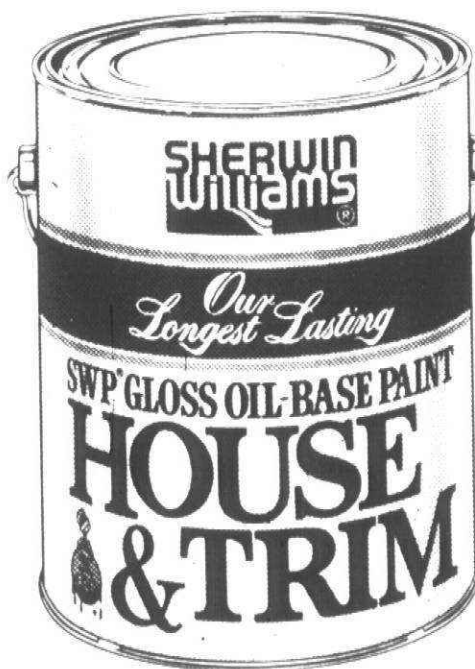

The sale will be open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. May 2, and from 9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. May 3.

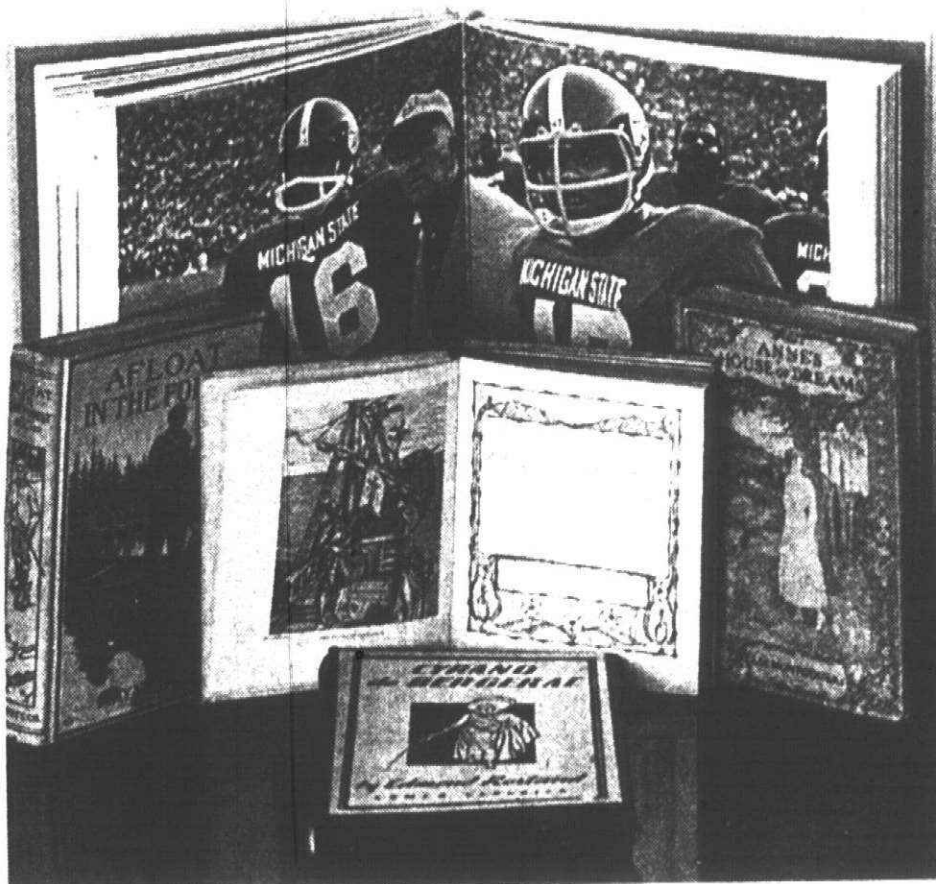
This year's collection includes books that cover every category of literature. There are many sets of encyclopedias, cookbooks, and a fine selection in the popular children's literature category.

Miller Woods nature walk set for Saturday

Nature lovers and wildflower enthusiasts have cause for rejoicing. The fourth annual spring walk through Mil-

ler woods is set for this Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. During these hours, visitors will have

an opportunity to tour one of the most interesting natural sites in the Plymouth-Canton community.

Labeled a "beech-maple climax forest," Miller Woods is an excellent example of what can happen to plant growth when left untouched for nearly 200 years.

King-sized maples and beeches abound and co-exist in the rich soil with many varieties of shrubs and plants.

In the spring, an unusually fine display of wild flowers can be observed. Early spring flowers include spring beauty, harbinger of spring, hepatica, squirrel corn and trout lily.

For novices in the art of flora identification, members of the Miller Woods Committee and other experienced naturalists will be on hand to lead small groups along the walk and identify the various wildflowers and shrubs.

And for those who are unable to attend Saturday, another walk is scheduled for Sunday, May 4, from 1 to 4 p.m.

THE WOODS is situated on Powell Road near Ridge Road. To get there, take West Ann Arbor Trail to Powell Road. Continue south on Powell for two miles until reaching the woods, which

is on the right side of the road.

The woods is owned by the Plymouth-Canton Community School District. For many years, the 10-acre parcel of land was a dumping ground. In 1975 the Miller Woods Committee was formed to preserve the site. Since then, the trash has been cleared and the area has been returned to its natural state.

In the past year, the Pilgrim Garden Club donated \$250 to aid in these efforts.

Woods Committee members include Penny Wright, chairman; Gerald Volrath, Pat Atchinson, Evelyn Edgar, Herb Conant and Irene Truesdell. They will act as guides along with Mark Griffiths and Tom Friedlander of Ann Arbor.

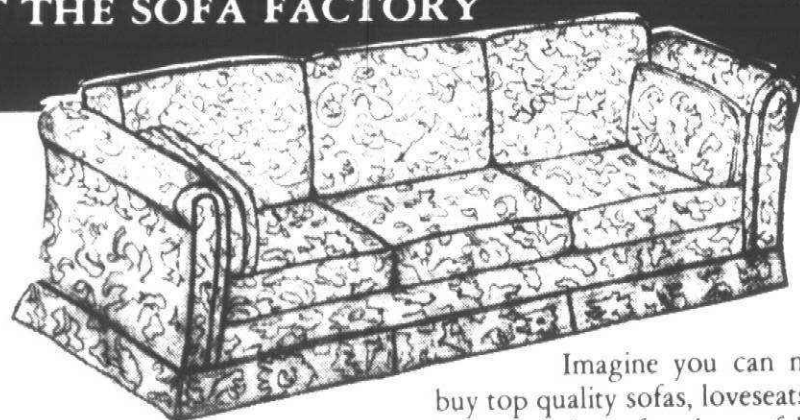
Hoke will use volunteers from the audience to demonstrate hypnotism.

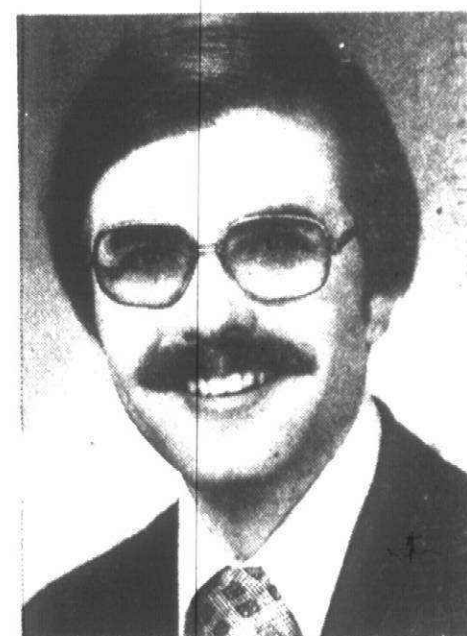
Heneveld is installed

Fudgesicles and licorice whips, Candy bars and potato chips. Chocolate soda, chewy yum, How about some bubble gum? Circus peanuts, pizza pies, Lik M' Aide and French fries. Tollhouse cookies, marshmallow, Mouth's too full to say hello!

The child's dream world often consists of these and other questionable "foods." Though their bodies take in these goodies, and though they enjoy them on the way down, how can we teach them that these foods are not ideal for fostering growth? By using plants as an analogy!

If a plant does not get the proper kinds of nourishment, it will not grow. So, too, if a child does not get the proper sustenance, he will not reach his full potential.

All a seed requires is the proper sprouting environment. Rather than mixing the necessary dirt components for this beginning example, the seed's "complete meal" can be purchased from your local nursery and is

called a peat pot. Peat pots are small, circular discs composed of compressed sterile sphagnum peat with fertilizer added and enclosed in mesh.

By using peat pots you add a bit of intrigue and wonder. If water is added to the peat pot, it will expand to several times its size. (The analogy for human growth and development is obvious.)

Simply drop some seeds on top, place in a warm spot, and keep slightly moist. Once the seeds have sprouted, the whole peat pot can be set out in your garden without the worry of transplant shock. Oh, for peat's sake.

Melvyn Douglas wore a bathrobe for interview

Melvyn Douglas disappointed me. He wasn't at the Academy Awards presentation to accept his Oscar, and I wanted to see how he looked in a tuxedo.

The last time I saw Melvyn Douglas off-stage, he was wearing his bathrobe.

The scene was the long ago and far away Shubert Theater in Detroit. Along with the Cass Theater, the Shubert gave Detroiters the best glimpse of a real New York playhouse. Dog-eared and an unpretentious hole-in-the-wall, the Shubert glittered with acting.

Backstage was equally dismal. It consisted of a long line of dressing room doors. Behind one sat the star. Which one? Only the stage manager knew the well-kept secret.

I was a high school senior when I slipped the stage manager the password: "Mr. Douglas is expecting me."

He was. The day before when he had answered his hotel telephone, Melvyn Douglas had succumbed to my line.

"Excuse me for bothering you," I sweetly apologized, "but I didn't know where else to reach you. I'm a high school student and I write a celebrity column for a Detroit newspaper. I'm sure my readers would love to know the real Melvyn Douglas. Could we meet sometime this week?"

It worked. Just as it did with Henry Fonda, Julie Harris, Van Heflin, Sidney Blackmer, Eddie Bracken, Sophie Tucker, Hildegard, and others. Douglas invited me to meet him in his dressing room between the matinee and evening performances the following day.

APPREHENSIVELY, I knocked on the dressing room door. In the 1956 interview, I wrote:

"When the door opened, a tall, debonair gentleman with a small mustache stood before me. It was then I became acquainted with the distinguished actor with a delightful sense of humor."

Never did I mention in the entire article why I had commented on Douglas' delightful sense of humor. I was too embarrassed!

How do you suppose a teen-age female feels upon finding herself alone in a dressing room with a bare-legged, bathrobe clad male star of stage and screen?

Uncomfortable.

Noting my uneasiness, Douglas graciously offered me a chair accompanied by an explanation.

"You see I dressed appropriately for the occasion — an intimate chat between friends."

In addition, he insisted my photographer wait in the hallway saying, "I would rather be alone with you."

A warm laugh followed betraying the actor's teasing nature. The fact that Douglas is a genuine, compassionate human made him most memorable. The hours passed that afternoon and it was more of a conversation between friends than an interview.

BORN IN GEORGIA yet spending his early childhood in New York, the twice-winning Oscar Award actor didn't really get his start in the Big Apple.

"I was 19 when I first did Shakespearean theater in Chicago," began Douglas. "But I really learned to act in Detroit. Jessie Bonstelle gave me my first real acting lessons."

Douglas was referring to the Jessie Bonstelle Theater which existed in the present Wayne State area, and to the great lady of the stage who gave the theater its name.

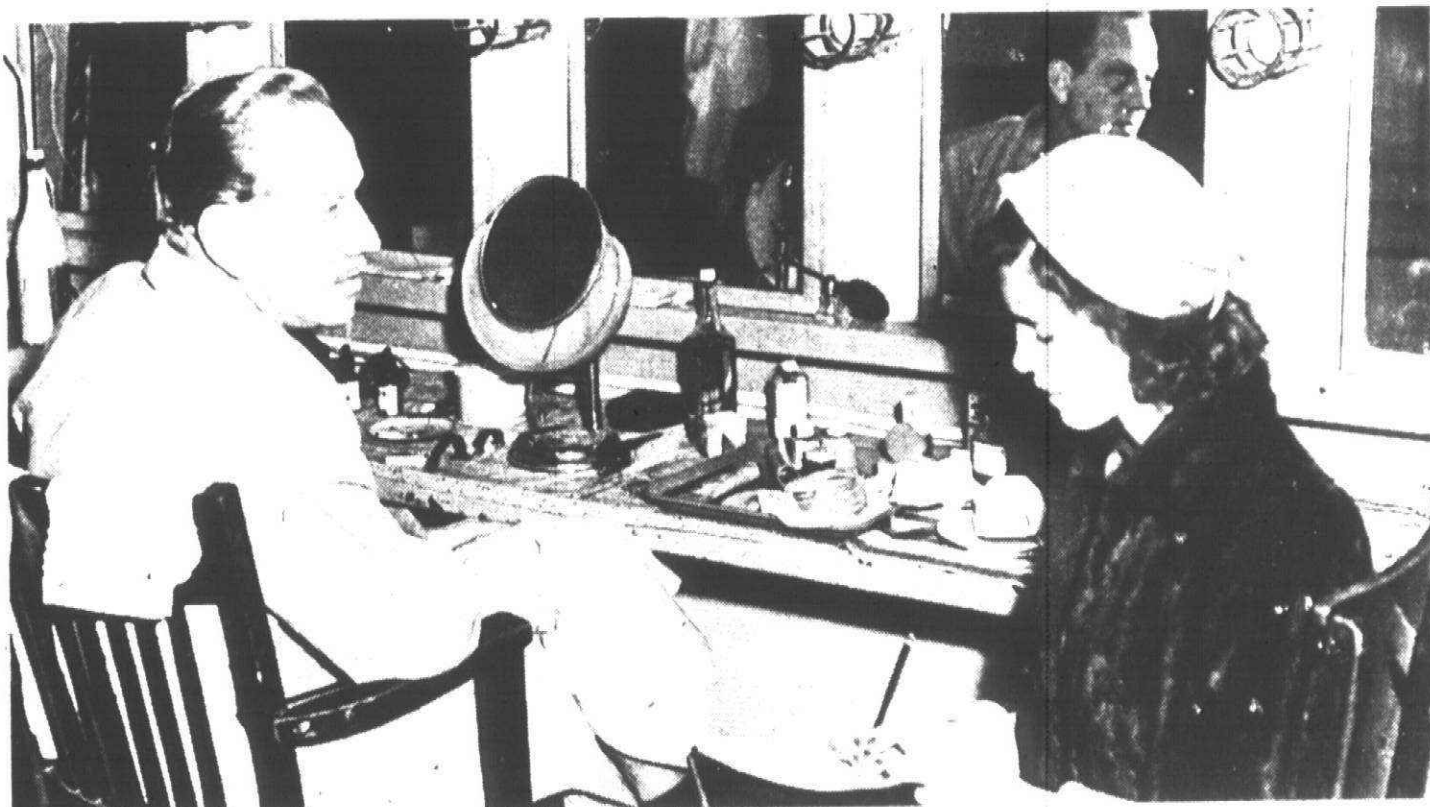
"New York is the Mecca of all actors," said Douglas. "So many actors waste their life beating on the gates of New York and are never admitted."

What did Melvyn Douglas advise young acting hopefuls? "Don't go to New York until New York calls for you," is how he put it.

Douglas' own screen premier came in the mid 1930s with actress Gloria Swanson.

In the early 1950s, Douglas directed and starred in the New York production of "Glad Tidings." I had played the ingenue lead in the Detroit production of "Glad Tidings" the year before I met Douglas.

I still recall how unbelievable it was when Douglas asked my interpretation of the role he had directed on Broadway. He would throw me a cue and expect me to deliver the line. All of this was consuming his valuable time between performances. Yet he remained unconcerned.

A chance at fame

Young and old, they keep trying

For some people, a job, a house and a chance to relax is enough.

For others, a chance at the big time is one of the necessities in life.

Take Ken Williams and Shelly Lyons. They both want to make it big in country music.

"I love it. Country-western comes from the heart," Williams says. "When people listen to it, they say, 'Hey, that's how I feel.'"

And rock music? "It sounds like they're going crazy," Shelly says. "You can hardly understand it."

THE TWO are at different points in their lives. Williams is 49 — by day, a mild-mannered buyer for Ford Motor. Shelly is 10 — a fifth-grader who practices at home each night with her parents.

They're among about 250 people who have entered a country music talent contest scheduled for this weekend at the State Wayne Theater, Michigan Avenue at Wayne Road. Preliminaries start at 11 a.m. Friday and Saturday, with finals starting at 1 p.m. Sunday. Admission each day is \$3 for adults, \$1 for children.

Winners will get to perform in a traveling barn dance this summer and get a chance to perform at the Michigan Opry with a name act.

"I've made some money but I've never really made a living at it," says Williams, who lives in Westland. He has composed about 80 songs and worked his way through college singing with the Don Large Chorus on WJR radio. His grandfather played banjo in the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville.

"The biggest thing I'd like to do is get recognition for my song writing," he says. "It's a therapeutic thing to have a feeling and write it down."

"A fella may have all the ability in the world. But if he doesn't have the intestinal fortitude, he isn't going to make it."

Williams will be on stage sometime Friday afternoon in the male vocalist category, doing a couple of his own compositions — things like "High and Dry," one of his favorites.

"It has to do with a gal leavin' a guy and the pain involved in that," he says.

"Trying to find an answer to how we can live together. Those things permeate my songs."

SHELLY GOT her start about a year ago in a local gong show.

She had been singing to herself for a couple years and her father was trying to convince her to try it in public. But she wasn't buying it.

Then she saw a performance by the Kendalls, a country father-daughter team, and Dad's idea suddenly made sense.

"I was pretty nervous," she says of that first public show.

But that problem is gone.

Now she works on her voice and memorizes new songs.

"As long as she wants to, we'll keep working with her," says her father, Roger. She'll be on stage Friday, in the category for best female vocalist under 16.

Shelly admits to sometimes after school wanting to do something besides practice music. "Usually, he don't have to tell me to play," she says.

But Shelly, who seems much older when she sings despite her young voice, doesn't study music at all in school. She's learned everything at home with her parents in Taylor.

"The music and gym teacher got laid off," she explains.

Her father Roger says she picks up music faster than he expected.

"She stays ahead of me," he says. "She catches it real easy, real fast."

Who would she most like to be? "Dolly Parton," she says. "Well, not exactly."

Quiet restaurant jumps with jazz on Sundays

Where can you find an honest-to-goodness jam session these days? In very few places.

Most recently, jam sessions have become a regular happening at the Cafe Fior, 29121 Northwestern, Southfield.

At the urging of public relations manager and professional singer Patty Haack, the art of the jam session is being rediscovered on Sunday nights. Ms. Haack has persuaded owner John Young to open his Italian food restaurant up to authentic improvisational sessions.

"I wanted to bring jazz back to Southfield," said Ms. Haack. She doesn't mind getting up and singing herself during a jam session. "The area lacks music in general, but it also is devoid of jazz and art in particular. I'd like to create an environment that will be fun and exciting, especially on Sunday nights."

THE JAM SESSIONS, which began March 16, have already attracted a number of people who brought musical instruments, ready to sit in with the regular quartet led by George "Sax" Benson.

Benson is a saxophone player who was around Detroit in the '40s and '50s when jam sessions were still going on. Beginning at 7:30 p.m. Sundays, Benson leads a quartet composed of pianist Gary Shunk, bassist Danny Jordan and drummer Larry Bell, in regular sets. Later in the night, young musicians can take their turns on the bandstand.

In opening sets, as customers drift in and get settled with pizza and drinks, the George Benson quartet shows its power. Benson improvises modern lines at breakneck speed. The ideas are stated and tossed off with cogency.

Shunk is a modern stylist who could blow away many a better-known piano player. Together, the quartet can unleash high quality creativity on a Charlie Parker tune, "Body and Soul," "April in Paris" or "I Got Rhythm."

MENTION THE BLUE Bird Inn, the Parrot, the Flame or the 12 Horseman to some people who were around Detroit in the late '40s and early '50s, and

one thing comes to mind — the jam session.

After 1945, the golden era of the big bands had dimmed. Jazz musicians, ever driven by creative ingenuity, were on the lookout for escapes from the strictures of those large ensembles. Musicians returned from duty during the war and everyone was ready to experiment with something new.

Some musicians with an ear for modern sounds were influenced by the bebop cues of Charlie Parker, Thelonious Monk and Dizzy Gillespie. A new way of exchanging free musical ideas needed an arena.

A smoky bar or night club after hours seemed to be ideal for what was innovative and new in jazz. The jam session was the medium for musicians coming together to try out their new melodic lines and "sitting in" was the common practice.

The result was a sometimes intense, sometimes relaxed, but always free-wheeling flow of musical energy that provided a good time for the audience and a superb training ground for the aspiring jazz musician.

BETWEEN SETS BENSON told about what jam sessions were like 20 years ago. Then, a musician had to contend with the like of Tommy Flanagan, Herman Wright, Alvin Jackson, Barry Harris, Billy Mitchell, Yusef Lateef and Thad Jones.

In those days you could sit in on a jam session somewhere in Detroit every night of the week, Benson said.

"Some were at the Blue Bird, the West Inn with Kenny Burrell, then there was the 12 Horsemen down on John R and Erskine. I remember they had a house band six nights a week, but one night a week all the musicians could come down and play," he said.

A jam session has no special rules, but it pays to be familiar with your instrument. "Usually," Benson said, "it was kept to the ones who knew they could play pretty good. The guys would remember if you didn't know your instrument too well and they might not let you back up very soon."

The established musicians also had

ways of letting a young musician know he had a lot more to learn. "They might give a new guy a hard time. If a song was written in a certain key, they might change it and play it in a strange key and, well, as you could imagine, they'd lose the newcomer."

"BUT ALL A JAM session was getting up and improvising. We'd play the melody in the first chorus, and after that it's all your own ideas. Everyone would take a turn and improvise for a few choruses," he said.

George Benson started playing the saxophone at age 11. Because his parents couldn't afford lessons, he picked up as much as he could about the sax from schools he attended.

"My first school was Columbian, an elementary school on the west side of Detroit. From there I went to McMichael Intermediate, and then to Northwestern High School. I just played around the city until I went into the service and played in the Army Band in 1952 and '53.

"After the service, I did club work around Detroit for quite a little while. There was the Parrot, the Flame, the

Royal Blue and the Twenty Grand. Those were some of the clubs I played at."

BENSON DID STUDIO work for Motown and played in the Austin-Moro Big Band and the New McKinney Cottonpickers. More recently, he has worked regularly with Jerry Fenby Five, as well as teach jazz improvisation and theory at Henry Ford Community College. By day, his job is mail carrier.

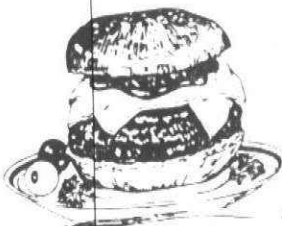
As he was growing up, his own biggest influence was saxophonist Coleman Hawkins. "We would sit up and

listen to his records all night," Benson said.

He adds some advice for younger musicians: "Listening is good. It gives a concept of how to play jazz. There are a lot of records, and once you listen enough to get the basic concepts, then you can formulate your own ideas."

W.C. at his finest, Errol in his boots

"The Bank Dick," 1 p.m. Tuesday, Channel 50. Hyperbole aside, one of the funniest films you'll ever see.

W.C. Fields is at the apex of his career in this 1940 classic — a mishmash of his best bits dating back to Fields' vaudeville days.

Already 60 years old when the movie was made, "The Bank Dick" could be considered Fields' swan song. "Never Give a Sucker an Even Break" would follow, but it and other later films would cast Fields as a caricature of his former self.

"Bank Dick" was written by Fields under the pen name of Mahatma Kane Jeeves. In it he portrays Egbert Souze (pronounced Soo-say, with the accent over the e).

Other characters include Fields' wife and daughter, Agatha and Elsie Mae Adele Brunch Souze; another daughter, Myrtle, and her boyfriend, Og Ogilby; con man A. Pismo Clam; bank robbers Filthy McNasty and Repulsive Rogan; and a bank examiner, J. Pinkerton Snooping-ton.

Oh, yes — much of the action takes place in the Black Pussy Cat saloon.

The film has a plot line, but it's really unimportant. What is important is that Fields has a free hand in creating one hilarious situation after another en route to a conclusion that will warm the cockles of any Fields fan's heart.

As always, W.C. is nagged by a wife who doesn't understand him, and despised by children — here, his youngest daughter.

Elsie Mae throws rocks at her father and calls him names and has the audacity to complain, "You don't love me."

With that, Fields raises his hand as if to cuff the brat, then mutters, "Don't tell me I don't love ya, ya little girl."

Also starring Grady Sutton, longtime Fields drinking partner, as Og.

During Errol Flynn's trial for statutory rape in 1942, Betty Hansen told a crowded courtroom that the real-life swashbuckler made love to her while both were nude but for the shoes on their feet.

At the time, Flynn was starring in the story of Gen. George Armstrong Custer, "They Died with Their Boots On."

Far from killing Flynn at the box office, his trial — and subsequent acquittal — for the rape of two California

teen-agers made Flynn an even greater drawing card. Among the many who came to the Aussie's defense was the American Boy's Club and its representative, a young William F. Buckley Jr.

"In like Flynn" was the rallying cry, and one wag commented: "Accusing Errol Flynn of rape is like charging a man with eating at a banquet."

But in "Northern Pursuit," Flynn is a Nazi... or is he?

You begin to wonder as this World War II tale of Canadian Mounties and German saboteurs unravels in the wilds of the Great North. The script isn't much, and the accent is on action, but Flynn comes across with a certain double-edged gusto.

Oddly enough, Errol was hospitalized on the set of the film for about a week with tuberculosis, but you'd probably never guess it to see the picture.

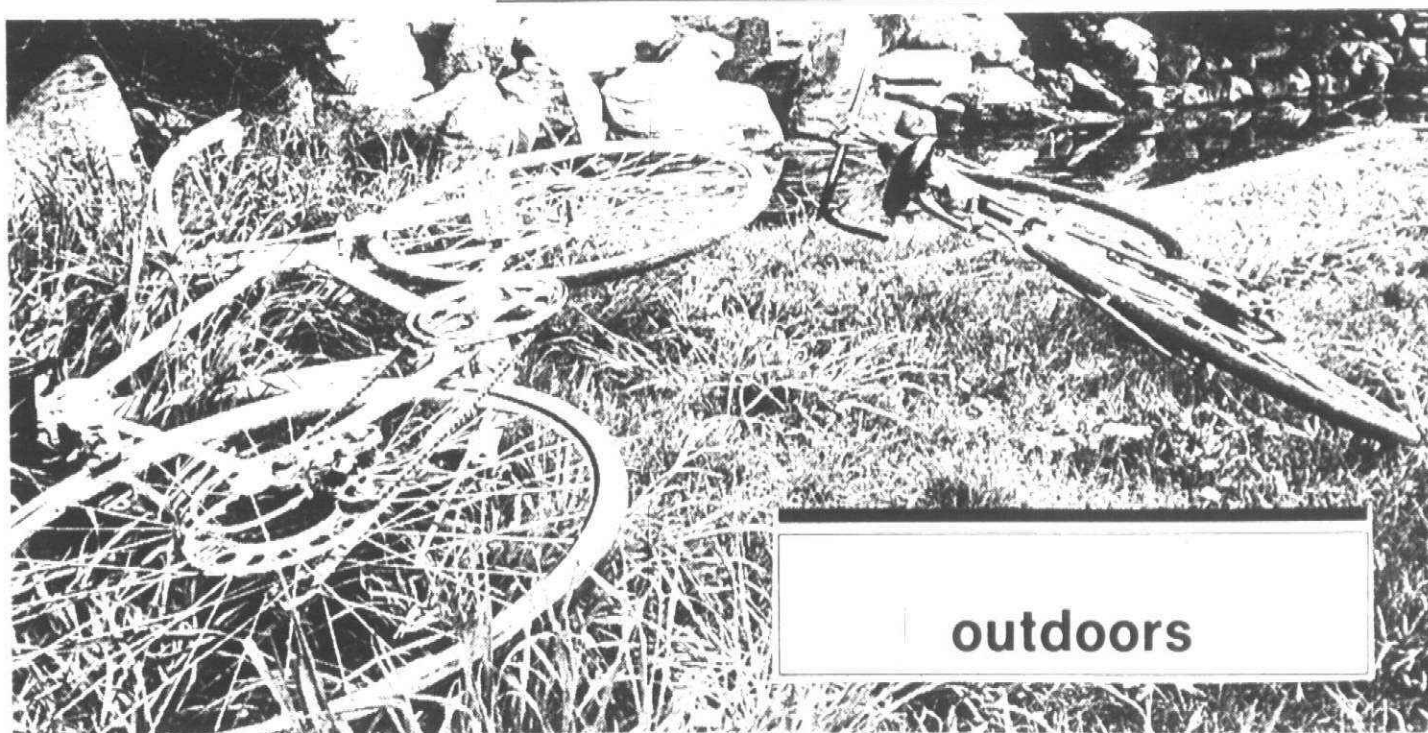

A bicycle trip through the north

There's one group which won't barrel through the Upper Peninsula so fast that they can't drink in the scenery of God's country.

They're going by bicycle.

Patrick Livingston, Wayne County 4-H youth agent, said older teens and adults are invited to pedal up to 1,000 miles on a "Coast the Coast" bike tour of the U.P.

The tour will run from July 20 to Aug. 6. Beginning at Frankfort, the cyclists will cross Lake Michigan by ferry to Wisconsin, then bike from Green Bay along the northern U.P. shore to St. Ignace.

"The tour is an excellent way for bicyclists to get on-the-road experience, meet new friends and enjoy the scenic countryside," said Livingston. "Participants also gain a tremendous amount of pride in themselves after completing the bicycle tour."

It should also be quite an adventure. Participants must be at least age 12, unless accompanied by an adult, and

must complete a 15-hour training session prior to the tour. Training will be conducted in various areas across the state.

Tour cost is \$5 a day, which covers lodging and meals. You'll probably want to bring some spending money, too, though you won't need any \$1.30 gasoline money.

You can pedal the entire trip or leave the caravan at Frankfort, Ironwood, Keweenaw, Marquette or Grand Marais.

To make a reservation or ask questions, contact Patrick Livingston at the Wayne County Cooperative Extension office, 721-6576.

SOMETIMES anglers call to ask if I know whether the trout will be biting opening day, which is this Saturday.

Well, you'll all have to answer the question for yourselves, but I can give one hint:

Trout and wives think alike. If your wife talks ambitiously about how the garage needs painting or the yard needs raking or the basement needs cleaning, then the trout are going to be

ambitious, too. Get out of the house and go trout fishing.

Closest trout water is the Huron River in the Proud Lake State Recreation Area, up around Wixom in Oakland County. The section from Moss Lake (the lowest one in the Proud Lake chain) to 100 yards west of Wixom Road has special restrictions from April 1-25. It's catch-and-release fishing only on artificial flies.

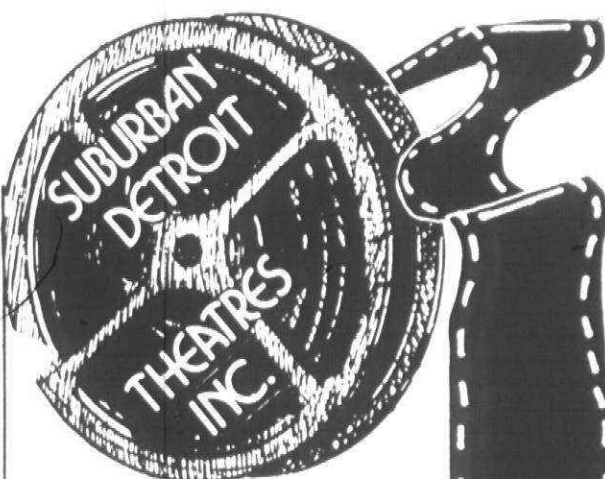

Oakway: Young players show great ability

Displaying her artistic talent and technical skill as a violinist, Sara Parkins of Birmingham performed the hauntingly beautiful "Scottish Fantasia" by Max Bruch with the Oakway Symphony Orchestra last weekend. She received the \$1,000 first prize in the Young Artist Contest sponsored by the Oakway Symphony Orchestra Society.

The simple melody of the "Scottish Fantasia" is deceptive of the technical skill required by its many double stops as the piece moves so melodically through the dramatic and quiet folk tunes to its powerful ending. All of this Ms. Parkins, a student at Julliard's Pre-College School of Music, played with the command and poise which won her the first place prize and brought her a standing ovation from the audience.

The Saturday event at Harrison High School in Farmington Hills was a beautifully arranged concert of music ranging from the 17th to 19th century. The four top winners in the contest soloed with the symphony under Francesco Di Blasi.

RECEIVING a second-place award and \$750 was Suzanne Lai Leon. She performed the "Symphonie Espagnole" by Edouard Lalo, another dramatic violin solo. Ms. Leon, a student at Curtis Institute in Philadelphia, performed its many arpeggios in a very lively and spirited manner. Her vast stage experience and many solo appearances in Detroit and on the East Coast were apparent.

The University of Michigan was well represented by the third and fourth place winners. Scott Woolweaver, now a student at Boston University, won \$750 and third place with a sensitive performance of Hummel's "Fantaisie for Viola."

The two fourth-place winners, oboist Cynthia Koleda and hornist David Everson, are both juniors at the University of Michigan.

While it is an unusual opportunity when an audience can enjoy a viola or an oboe solo with a symphony, even more rare is the opportunity to enjoy a horn concerto. David Everson played Strauss's Concerto No. 1 for French Horn (Allegro) and Cynthia Koleda performed Marcello's Concerto in D minor for Oboe. Both won \$250.

Plymouth: Fine 'Passion' spans old and new

The Joneses make superb guests. They are talented, interesting and likeable, and they should be asked back.

The unrelated Joneses are Robert W. and Marilyn S., composer and conductor.

Robert, a music instructor at Schoolcraft College, is composer of "Passion," performed Sunday afternoon in Plymouth by the Plymouth Symphony and the Schoolcraft College Community Choir, under the baton of Ms. Jones.

It was an outstanding performance, marred only by the beauty of the weather which probably kept some people from attending.

Jones' "Passion," the story of the Crucifixion based on the Gospel of St. Matthew with verses by Anne Herter Jones, the composer's wife, may have had more impact on the audience had it been performed a month or two earlier, when our thoughts were on Easter and the weather outside was not a distraction.

It should be performed again, with this in mind. Also, it should be heard again because music is much like a pair of new shoes. We really can't tell whether or not it's going to be comfortable until we get used to it.

Even Handel's "Messiah" was not an immediate hit when it was first heard in London, and Handel withdrew it for several years.

THE JONESES are certainly comfortable working with a choir and orchestra. Ms. Jones is the regular conductor of the Schoolcraft choir, and Jones has often accompanied them.

In "Passion," Jones has created a work which is modern enough to be interesting, traditional enough not to be grating. It is much more dramatic than the Bach "St. Matthew Passion," and, in keeping with our time, a little frantic.

In the tradition of Bach and his predecessors, tenor Phil Mooney, as the narrator, was accompanied by the piano, and bass-baritone Carroll Strickland, as Jesus, was accompanied by strings. Both gave flawless performances, as did Brian Murphy in the dramatic speaking role of Pilate. His prosecuting attorney style was an effective contrast to the music.

Carolyn Grimes was the soprano soloist. Jones described her voice as being "velvet, lustrous." But the solos written for her were too much velvet, not enough luster.

JONES THE conductor handled both the orchestra and chorus with unobtrusive skill, catching emotional shadings in a way that made the performances rich and colorful.

The program began with Serenade to Music by Ralph Vaughan Williams, which made it longer than most Plymouth Symphony concerts. This was not a hardship, though, and it was a wise beginning. There are similarities between Jones' work and that of the late English composer.

Not only do both come from the same island, although Jones' heritage is Welsh, but both are not afraid to experiment. Vaughan Williams used many English folk melodies; there's an undertone of jazz in much of Jones' works.

And both have a sense of humor. Jones' burst forth in the song "The Disciples All Flee." "Go, scam, fly," they're told. It was delightful.

There may be another similarity between Jones and Vaughan Williams. When the latter announced his ambition to become a composer, his maiden aunts shook their heads in disapproval. Composing was so risky that they couldn't take his ambition seriously.

Both Joneses should be invited back soon. Maiden aunts we don't need in this generation of easy listening and hard rock. They are notorious non-honors of prophets and creativity.

Kids at home deserve special consideration

Most homes built in the last decade are inhabited by children. Children are definitely people and should be treated as such. When you come across a home where children are present, you are likely to find a place provided for their needs.

Children need to be given a place of their own, a place where a few private possessions kept in their own space give them a feeling of ownership and privacy. A child will hardly become a house wrecker if a play space is provided where there is plenty of light, floors that are indestructible, walls with washability and furniture which will take some abuse. The area should include storage that can grow with the child. These are the basic considerations.

A child has active and noisy moments, quiet moments and times when privacy is needed. The child's area requires space for play, toys, hobby and study, walls on which to mark and pin things, closets with dual purpose, creative equipment areas.

Colorful surroundings and good lighting are very important when planning a room for a youngster. Whether the room is a bedroom, playroom, an area of the family's living room or a specific recreation room, the child's needs should be taken into account.

Storage space within reach of the child should be built into the rooms. Inexpensive cabinets may be built of plywood by the parents and should be arranged at a low level so the child may be taught to put away things not in use. Open shelves on which children can place toys should be adjustable to hold items of varying sizes and weights.

A room can be a child's inspiration or decorated in a manner that allows for freedom of movement. The floor might be covered with a linoleum during the early years so messes and spills can be wiped away easily.




There is little use putting fabrics that cannot be touched into a child's room. Use the simplest washable covers, curtains and area rugs if you use any at all.

Furniture in the room should have durable surfaces. Table or dresser tops of high-pressure laminated plastics will withstand hard knocks, crayon drawings and clay modeling. Modular furniture designs leave room to grow in a room not specifically designed for an infant but for an adolescent.

A desk-type table can be built by using a deep shelf going completely across one wall.

SLOTING AND SPLITTING

Occasionally it may be necessary to "slot" a checker on an open point in your home board in hopes of closing that point on the next roll.

Whether your opponent is able to hit is up to the dice. Leaving a direct double shot, however, is not always desirable.

In the example, white has a one-four roll to play. How should white play it?

Since black violated the principle of slotting and splitting, white should take full advantage of this error in play.

THE MOVE...

Hitting the blot on black's 5 point with the four roll is the first priority. White should also further the attack by slotting and hitting black on white's 5 point with the one roll.

Why? If white does not slot on the 5 point and hit a second checker, black would have little difficulty getting one checker off the bar and perhaps covering the 5 point blot. White will have excellent prospects for a victory if black fails to hit.

Take advantage when you see your opponent slotting and splitting and your dice dictate hitting both. In the example, it appears that white was also slotting and splitting, but he was hitting.
