Canton manager concept explored by panel

The notion doesn't exactly thrill Canton's chief elected officer, but a number of citizens find intriguing the concept of hiring a manager to oversee township administration.

Supervisor Noel Culbert was one of three panelists Tuesday night at a dinner meeting called to explore the feasibility of installing a manager or supervisor at township hall.

Impetus for the meeting was provided by Bart Berg, a former township planning commissioner who is active in many local affairs.

The other panelists — who were

far more supportive of the manager concept than Culbert — were John Gilmour Jr., superintendent of Bridgeport Township near Saginaw; and William Thomson, supervisor of Kalamazoo Township.

Robert Padgett, planning commission chairman, served as moderator for the panel discussion.

All three officials were in agreement on one thing. According to each, things are going fairly well for the charter township he represents, although the government set-up and problems varied.

"What is good in Bridgeport or Kalamazoo is not necessarily good

for Canton," said Culbert, who led off the panel.

"I think Canton is fairly efficient, probably the most efficient in the area. Every form of government is going to have certain inefficiencies."

CULBERT spent much of his allotted 20 minutes comparing Canton's economic condition to those of surrounding communities such as Plymouth.

"Canton ended the 1979 fiscal year with a cash surplus of \$1.2 million, while Plymouth's was \$14,000. Westland had a surplus of \$27,000.

"I think we all get tired of being treated as secondary citizens. We don't have to put up with it. We're not as bad as people like to believe," the supervisor said.

Later in the discussion, however, Kalamazoo Supervisor Thomson cautioned that a community with too large a cash reserve "might be an indication that the people are being overtaxed."

Thomson, on leave from his job as a social science associate professor at Western Michigan University, was recently named chief administrative officer of his township.

He said Kalamazoo Township had

a tradition of strong clerks and weak supervisors, but was forced to come up with a new system when it became a charter township this year. A charter township allocates more authority to the supervisor than does the straight township form of government.

"My recommendation was to follow the Delta Township system in which the clerk would become the manager and the supervisor would have a part-time, primarily public relations position," said Thomson, who wore a "Yes, there really is a Kalamazoo Township" button on his lapel.

"MY SECOND choice was to say 'the supervisor is taking over,' and as of last night I became chief administrative officer."

Thompson said public reaction to a suggestion to hire a manager was unfavorable "because they figured I was just looking for a way to get out of the office and teach my classes."

According to Gilmour, the superintendent system came to Bridgeport Township with little controversy.

In fact, Gilmour had served as a past Bridgeport Township supervisor.

"When I was supervisor, I was the only full-time elected officer. I was the only one on the board well informed on the issues," he said.

"The way I operate now, I give out information to all seven board members and strive to keep them equally informed. I think they do come to meetings better informed."

Gilmour said after he was hired as superintendent, the supervisor elected position went from full-time to part-time, with the clerk, treasurer and supervisor all receiving the same pay.

He added, "I used to say as supervisor that I had to get half of the people mad at me to get fired. Now I only have to get four (board members) mad."

That a superintendent's job is so much at the whim of a township board was one of Culbert's contentions why the position would not provide continuity in government.

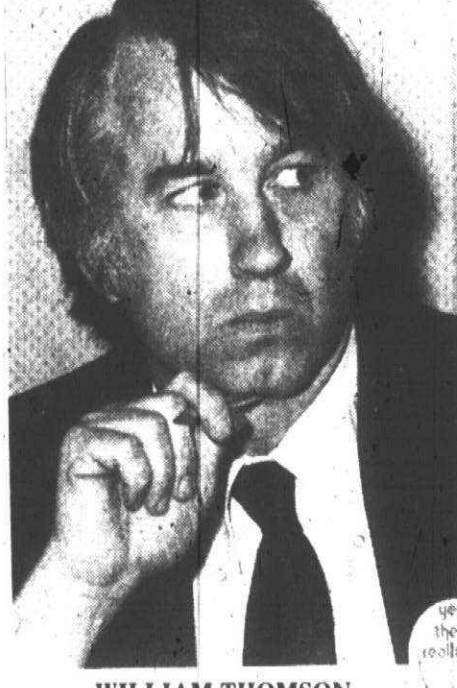

Schools will again ask for bond approval

Canton and Plymouth residents will be asked on June 9 to approve borrowing \$11 million to find classroom space for new students moving into the district.

Approval of the borrowing will allow a millage increase in the district.

The \$11 million bond request is about half of the amount requested by the board, and defeated by voters, last March 27.

Monday night the school board voted 6-1 to approve the ballot wording that now will be sent to the State Board of Education for approval.

The school board also is planning on

a second ballot proposal for June 9 that would generate funds for operation. Approval of the second ballot proposal, and final approval of the bond issue language, is expected to occur at the May 12 meeting of the board.

IN MARCH the school board asked voter approval of two bond issues — one for \$14.7 million and another for some \$7 million.

The \$7 million was to build classrooms at the high school site and to renovate Central for use as a high school. This \$7 million in projects has been dropped from consideration.

The \$11 million being requested is an abbreviated version of the \$14.7 million Proposal I from the March 27 election. Knocked out of the \$14.7 million is \$500,000 to purchase buses, \$3 million to renovate Central, and adjustments in contingency fund and individual improvement projects.

The \$14.7 million in March included about \$6 million to make Central safe for student occupancy regardless of whether the building would be used for middle school or high school students. That \$6 million has now been cut in half.

THE SECOND ballot proposal on June 9 will ask voters to give the school district permission to levy its full authorized millage.

Because of the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment, the district must lower its total millage rate by 1.32 mills unless residents vote otherwise at the polls.

The second ballot proposal, in effect, asks voters for permission to reverse the Headlee rollback of 1.32 mills and allow the district to levy next year the same amount of mills it now levies.

Dr. John M. Hoben, superintendent of schools, points out that the second ballot proposal would be much like a millage renewal in that approval would not result in any tax increase but in continuation of the current levy.

In an earlier discussion Monday night, Hoben pointed out that the school district loses state aid as its taxbase increases. The loss of the 1.32 mills plus the loss in state aid will result in a 1980-81 budget shortfall of \$2 million. That means if the 1.32 mills is not restored, that some \$2 million in programs will be cut, he said.

RAY HOEDEL told the board that if the \$11 million loan is approved, the district will invest the money until it actually is needed.

Hoedel expects the district will earn about \$1.2 million in interest on the \$11 million borrowed that will result in a total of \$12.2 million being available for projects.

The \$11 million would be borrowed for a period of 17 years, instead of the 29 years the \$21 million-plus proposed as the term of indebtedness for the bonds rejected in March.

Hoedel said the bond consultants recommend the 17-year payback period to make the bond issues more marketable and because some of the current debt

will be paid off in between two-three years.

If voters approve the \$11 million bond issue on June 9, said Hoedel, an additional 1.1 mills will be levied in the first year to cover the debt. In the second year, Hoedel added, about half-a-mill additional will be levied and in the

third year the debt levy will be less than it is now.

For the owner of an \$80,000 home the \$11 million bond issue would cost an additional \$45 a year the first year and about \$20 a year more the second year. If the bond issue is approved, said

P-C student code makes no-paddling policy

Paddling students now longer will be allowed in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

But teachers may use physical force when necessary for self-defense or to protect a student from harming himself or others.

The issue on the use of physical force was the major point discussed in the new student code of conduct, which received final approval by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education Monday night.

The new code came to the board for approval after study and recommendation by a committee of some 45 parents, teachers, students and administrators.

In previous meetings there was little discussion about any part of the code except for those sections dealing with corporal punishment, which was the major change made in the code.

Another reason for the discussion

was that the teachers union objected to the change being made without it being negotiated.

Last month the committee was invited to reconvene, which it did, and discussions were held among members and the chief negotiator for the teachers' union. Once agreement was reached, the new code came back to the board for final review.

THE NEW POLICY specifically states that "corporal punishment in any form shall be excluded as an acceptable method of discipline at any level."

The code then defines corporal punishment "to include such acts as paddling or striking a student in any manner."

The definition goes on to state that corporal punishment does not include "acts of reasonable physical force in

maintaining discipline such as using reasonable physical force to detain a student or remove him/her from class when such action is warranted."

Trustee Flossie Tonda said she believes teachers should have the right to paddle students and she regretted it was being taken away by the new code.

The new student code, which takes effect July 1, also deals with such subjects as: responsibilities of students, parents, teachers, school employees and administrators; attendance; safety rules; vandalism; weapons; false fire alarms; drugs; dress code; rights to assembly and speech; freedom to publish; and freedom from unreasonable searches and seizures.

Couple mugged at rest stop; 3 held by police

Three men are awaiting examination in 35th District Court in connection with the robbery of a Southgate couple at an I-275 rest stop.

The three men held in Canton Township jail in lieu of bond are Jimmie Hammell, 22, Kennedy Marshall, 18, and Calvin Sparks, 18, all of Detroit. A fourth suspect has not yet been arrested.

Marshall, Hammell and Sparks have been charged with one count each of armed robbery and unarmed robbery. Their bail was set at \$50,000, \$25,000 and \$50,000, respectively. Preliminary examination will be May 4 before Judge James Garber.

According to Canton police, Eugene Floyd, 60, and his wife, Roselyn, 58, of Southgate stopped at the rest area between Palmer and Cherry Hill Road about 6 a.m. Sunday. Four men followed the couple into the shelter.

It was there, Floyd told police, that

one of the men picked him up, carried him into the men's room and held his face against the wall while a second man threatened him with a knife. The man demanded that Floyd give him his money and jewelry.

Before tying him to a safety rail in the men's room, the two men took about \$120 and two rings from Floyd's fingers.

The other two men followed Roselyn Floyd into the women's restroom where they forced her to lie face down on the floor while they took her purse and a watch.

According to police, one of the men also tried to rob another man who was sleeping in his car at the rest stop. The attempt was unsuccessful because the motorist had locked his car doors. It was this man who noted the license plate of the car that held the four men.

All the property has been recovered except for Mrs. Floyd's watch.

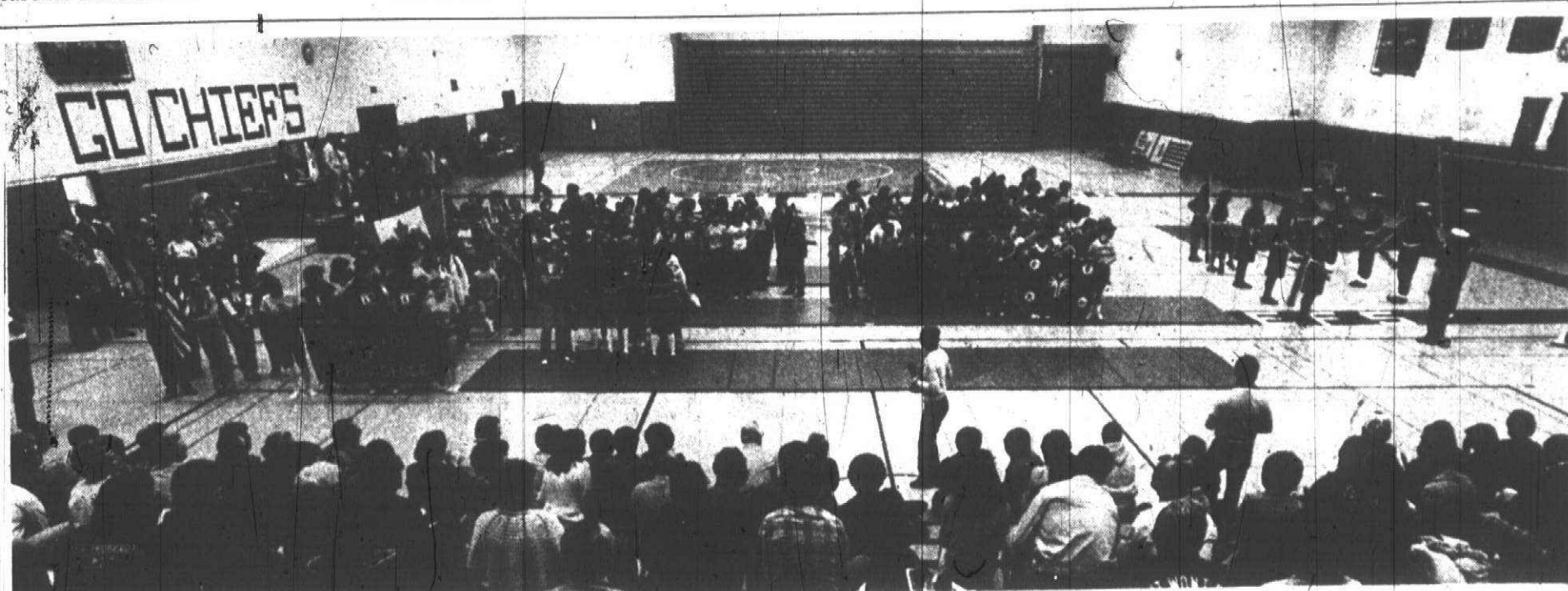

Book anti-theft devices are installed and operating

Last year an estimated 800 library books were stolen from Plymouth-Salem High School.

But school officials expect that theft rate to drop dramatically this year, thanks to a new special electronic security system.

The problem of book theft at local high schools has been costing thousands of dollars every year with little hope to combat it.

Librarians hope the new system installed in Plymouth-Salem and Plymouth-Canton high schools will virtually

eliminate book theft.

"Most of the students don't steal books with malicious intent," said Cathy Willis, librarian at Plymouth-Salem High. "They just take the books home to make sure they have them for reports or anything else."

Although the electronic system has only been in use since students returned from Easter vacation, librarians are very optimistic about it.

All the books in the library have been sensitized by a special process. If a student tries to go through the exit without getting the book desensitized, the

alarm goes off and the exit is blocked.

There have been a few bugs discovered in the system — such as a stiff entrance gate and the occasional false alarm because of a student's belt buckle.

According to the librarians, most of these problems have been worked out, and there has been a "fantastic student acceptance" of the machine.

If the alarm goes off when a student

tries to exit the library with a book, there is no punishment. The student is just told to step back and speak to the librarian on duty at the time.

The only punishment the student receives is embarrassment. The students in the library have been known to yell "You're busted!" when the alarm goes off.

Librarians at Plymouth-Salem stress what a good investment the system

was.

The total cost for the system at Plymouth-Salem was around \$9,000.

Cathy Willis estimates that the system will probably pay for itself in a year's time.

How to get work permits

The job placement office of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools has been designated as the issuing office for all work permits issued to minors living within the school district.

Youth (under age 18) who are employed may request a work permit from the job placement office located in Room 184 of Plymouth-Canton High School from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily.

Proof of age and a request form signed by the employer must be pre-

sented to the issuing office to obtain a work permit. Work permits for youth younger than 18 is mandated by state law (Youth Employment Standards Act of 1978).

The job placement office is open year-round to serve the needs of students and former students of the district and area employers.

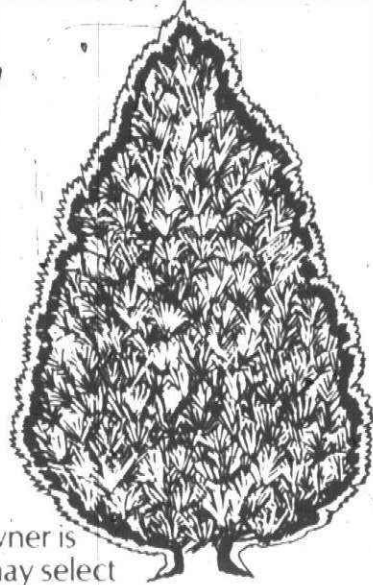
Funeral services were held recently for Eugene Starkweather, 69, of Palm Springs, Calif.

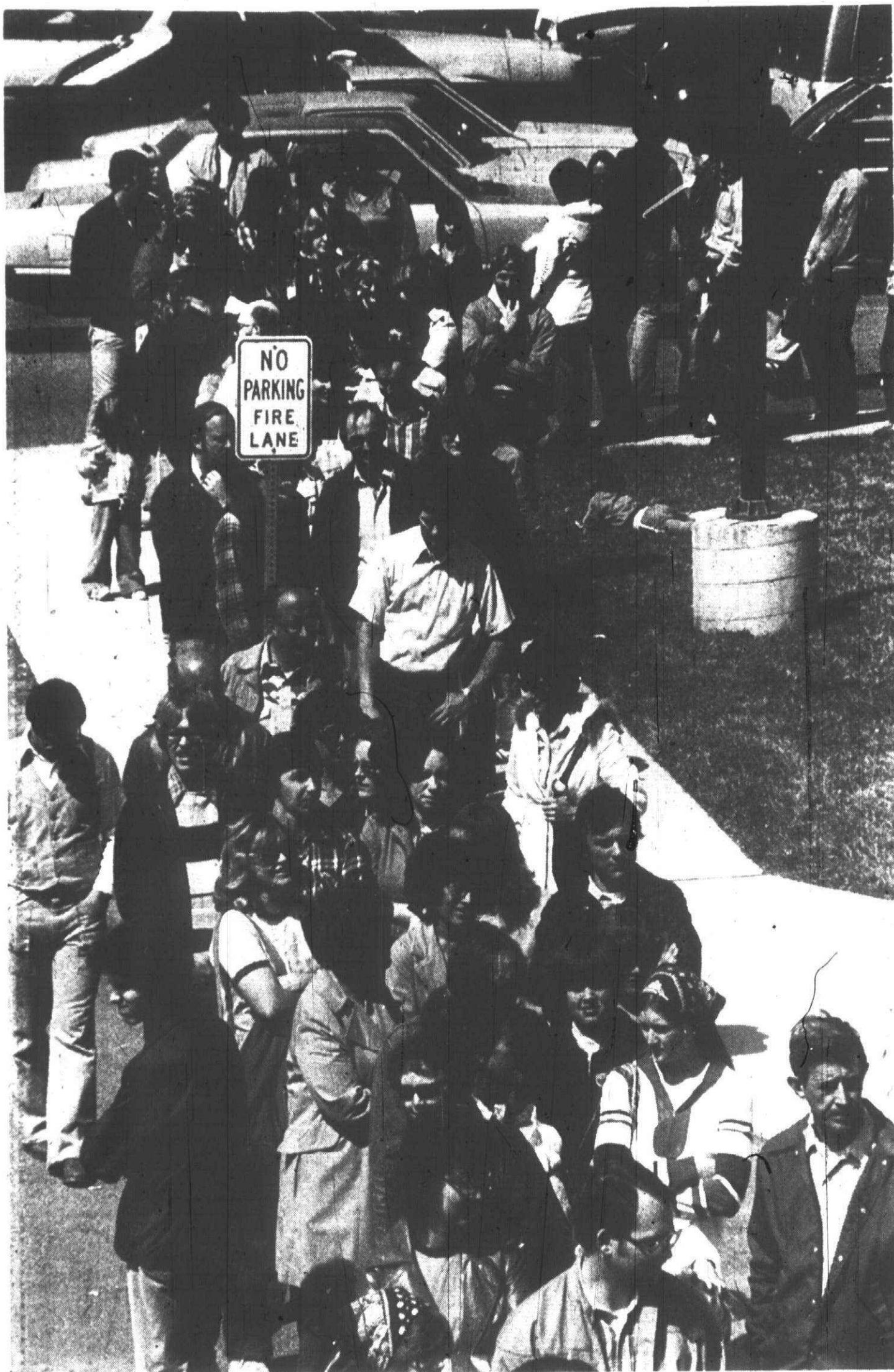

"PEOPLE SAY with a manager things will quiet down, and we won't have feuds. But do you recall the Fred Yockey (the city manager who was forced out by Plymouth's city commission last year) incident? Talk about a bloodletting."

However Thomson, who recently completed a study of the 14 townships in Michigan that do have managers or superintendents, said con-

stant turnover of hired chief administrators did not appear to be a problem.

"But if you have faction turnover, you're going to have manager turnover."

Although Thomson saw merit in the manager concept, he cautioned Canton to go into such a plan "with eyes open."

"You must realize you have something America wants — smaller

government. Make sure if you have a manager, you don't let him screw it up."

He added that a township can also get into trouble by putting too much dependence on professionals.

The decision to hire a superintendent could be made by the Canton board, possibly after putting an advisory question of the issue before the voters. A manager would have to answer to the board.

Hoedel, the net effect would be an additional \$65 in taxes paid for the life of the bonds for the owner of an \$80,000 home.

The district now levies 3.7 mills for debt retirement. If the \$11 million loan

given by a 6-1 vote of the board with trustee Elaine Kirchgatter voting "no," is approved, it would end up with a debt levy of only 3.5 mills in 1982. The added tax liability, Hoedel stressed, would be for 1980 and 1981 only.

Court fight looms on county reform

A suburban Wayne County group, which insists county government reorganization only proceed on the basis of 1980 census figures, will likely have to take its argument to court.

Following a nearly four-hour appearance Wednesday by John F. Dodge, Jr., an attorney representing the Wayne County Communities for Equal Representation, members of the county apportionment commission said they may be required to follow a 1972 charter commission district reapportionment plan for a charter commission to be seated this year.

IF APPROVED BY voters during the Aug. 5 primary election, a charter commission would be created to propose county government reorganization, including whether the county should be lead by an elected county executive or a county board appointed manager.

Before the election, however, the county apportionment commission is required to determine charter commission districts. If a charter commission is created, one representative would be elected from each charter commission district.

State Rep. William A. Ryan, D-Detroit, has asked Michigan Attorney General Frank Kelley whether charter district apportionment approved in 1972, and based on the 1970 census, precludes any further reapportioning for a 1980 charter commission.

"We must wait until we hear from the attorney general and do what he advises," said county Prosecutor William L. Cahalan, a member of the apportionment commission. Kelley's opinion, requested on April 18, is expected either this week or early next week.

Voters rejected creating a charter commission in November, 1972, so charter districts were never formed. The 1972 charter district apportionment, however, is identical to the current 27 county commissioner districts.

DODGE REQUESTED the apportionment commission wait "six to 10 months" for 1980 census figures before approving any charter commission districts.

Dodge was hired in March by the equal representation group, composed of 39 suburban cities and townships, to prepare a lawsuit seeking a charter commission based on the 1980 census.

Districts based on the 1970 census would deprive western and downriver county communities an equal vote on the charter commission, Dodge told the apportionment commission. He said current county commissioner districts no longer reflect equal representation based on the "one man, one vote" principle.

County reorganization has been proposed for 12 years, Dodge said. He added: "all of a sudden we have this tremendous hurry."

"We have a hurry because the the people in the City of Detroit want to use the 1970 census. They want to dominate the writing of a new charter. They know they don't have a right to dominate it based on population."

ALSO APPEARING before the apportionment commission Wednesday was Professor David Goldberg, an associate director of the University of Michigan Population Studies Center who said the 1970 census is, "totally inaccurate to represent the current population distribution of Wayne County."

Goldberg, who conducts an annual population study of the metropolitan area, has been retained by Dodge in preparation of the suit challenging use of the '70 census.

Goldberg said the county's 1970 population of 2,670,368 dropped to 2,405,127 by 1978. All but five of the 27 county commissioner districts lost population during that time, according to a chart he prepared.

Districts including Livonia, Garden City and part of Westland increased slightly by between 2,500 and 4,000 people, while the district including the Plymouth-Canton area increased by about 137,000.

The professor said Detroit lost 335,000 people between 1970 and 1978, while the out-county area (all county municipalities except Detroit) lost 68,000 during the same period.

Edison seeks new rate hike

Detroit Edison Co.'s request for a rate increase is "the largest amount ever requested" by the southeast Michigan electric utility, said its chief financial officer.

Ernest L. Gove Jr. said Edison is asking the Michigan Public Service commission for rate hikes that would yield \$463 million more revenue in three steps over two years.

To the average electric customer, the rate hikes, if granted by MPSC, would cost per month:

- \$2.66 in 1980, a 9.7 percent increase over the current average of \$29.99.
- \$2.66 on Jan. 1, 1981, an 8.9 percent increase over the then-current \$32.65.
- \$2.34 in mid-1981, a 7.2 percent increase over the then-current \$34.99, bringing the monthly average to a total of \$37.33.

GOVE SAID general inflation and high interest rates have had a heavy impact on Detroit Edison, a capital-intensive firm which borrows heavily for new investment funds.

In the 12 months ended in last month, Edison earned \$1.67 per common share, down from the 1979 earnings of \$1.90 and 1978's level of \$1.76.

The average return on common equity was 8.76 percent at the end of March 1980 compared to 9.91 percent in 1979 and 9.16 percent in 1978.

But Gove said Edison is seeking to lighten the homeowner burden with two other changes.

One is a new "lifeline" rate for low-income customers. The other is to extend its senior citizens rate to persons at age 62 instead of the current age 65. Some 75,000 more customers would be eligible, Gove said.

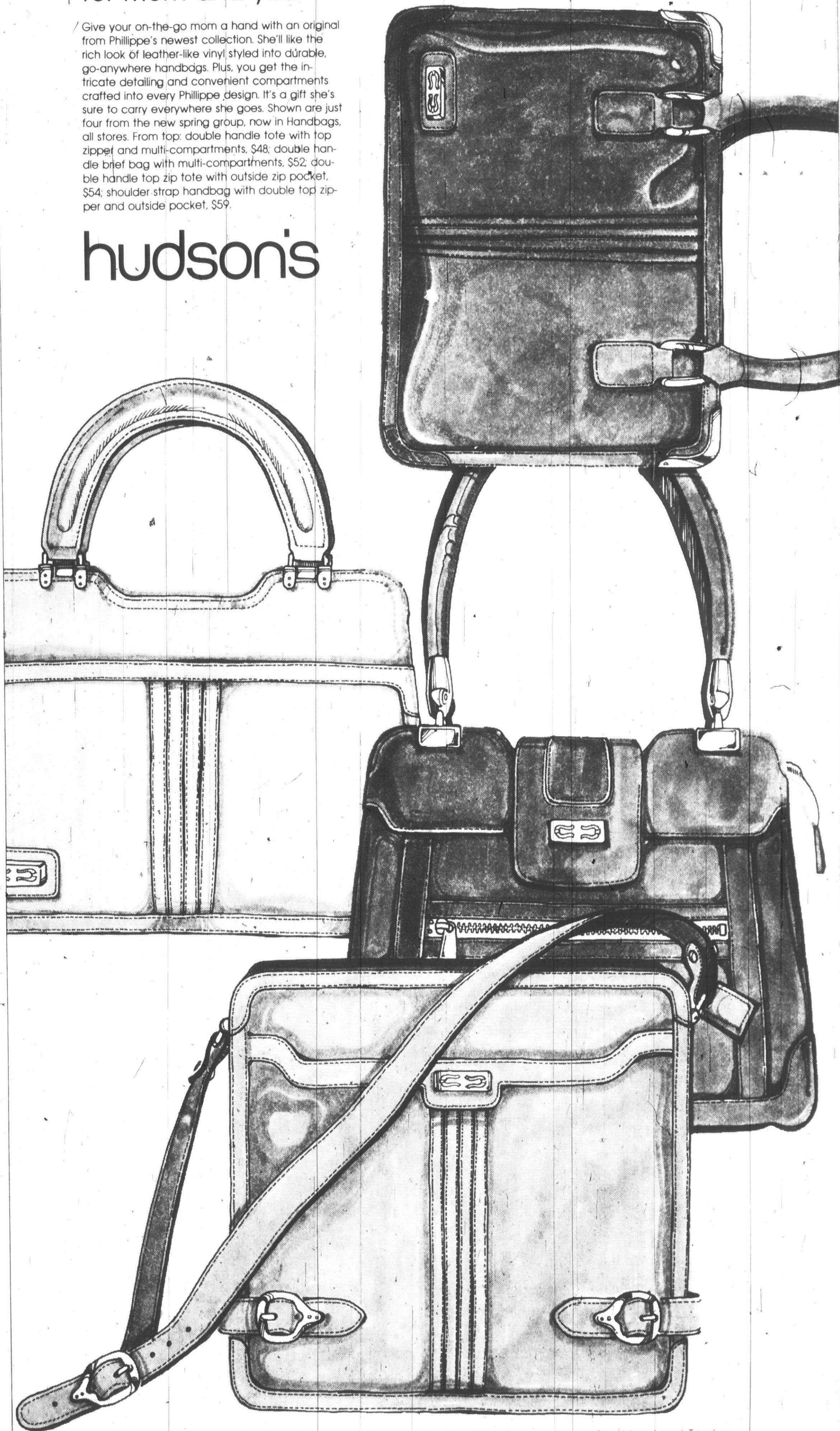
DESPITE inflation, Gove said, electricity is still taking the same proportion of the residential customer's budget in 1979 as it did in 1959 - about 1.5 percent.

This occurred "despite the use of almost twice as much electricity," the board vice chairman added. He said the cost of electricity rose 6.7 percent for the average residence last year while costs were increasing even faster. He did not immediately provide cost increase figures.

Schoolcraft awards degrees to 709

One student earned three degrees simultaneously, and another's mother traveled 15,000 miles to attend Sunday's commencement at Schoolcraft College.

Of the 709 persons who earned associate degrees and certificates during the 1979-80 school year, 187 donned robes for the traditional ceremonies. But that was just a fraction of the persons in northwest Wayne County served by the two-year college, according to President C. Nelson Grote.

Counting the 10,000 who enrolled in the last year, Schoolcraft has enrolled 121,000 persons — 92,000 in credit courses and 29,000 in community courses — since it opened its doors in 1964.

During the last year, another 10,000 attended workshops, conferences, dinner theaters and cultural events, Grote said, indicating the two-year college is "a quality institution, a mature institution."

ROBERT K. Robbins of 38543 Oran-gelawn, Livonia, was awarded three associate degrees — in arts, science and engineering.

Three other persons earned two diplomas: Kurt Baker of 35140 Leon, Livonia, degrees in arts and science; Donald Bristow, 1076 Kings Court, Canton, degree in applied science and certificate in metallurgy; and William Stimac, 30165 Joy, Westland, two certificates in climate systems specialties.

Thiruvani Sreedharan, Northville, a candidate for an applied science degree in data processing, was watched by her mother, Mrs. Thirumalai, who traveled from Banglor, India to see the ceremony.

FOUR HONORARY degrees were awarded.

The late Russell L. Isbister, superintendent of Plymouth School District when Schoolcraft was formed in 1961, received an honorary associate in arts posthumously. He was "active in his profession and community and took leadership roles in each, and he exhibited a sincere interest in others and an appreciation for individual differences and the unique contributions each could make to society," the citation said. The degree was accepted by his son, Robert.

Tim Richard, editorial page editor and county news specialist for Observer & Eccentric Newspapers, received an honorary associate in arts. He "has distinguished himself in managerial and editorial posts, earning a first prize from the national Sybarian Press Foundation for an editorial... (and) making a significant contribution to the passage of Open Meetings legislation and championing the rights of young citizens."

George E. Gullen Jr., president of Wayne State University from 1972-78, received an honorary associate in arts. He "became foremost in his understanding and appreciation of the community college movement and took leadership roles in articulation agreements and consortial efforts in order

that Wayne State might join with Schoolcraft and other community colleges in better providing post-secondary education."

U.S. Sen. Donald W. Riegle Jr., D-Michigan, the commencement speaker, received an honorary associate in arts. He has "distinguished himself in public service, having been elected a congressman in 1966 at age 28 and being reelected to four consecutive terms... and having been elected to the U.S. Senate in the fall of 1976..." It was the first honorary degree ever given Riegle by a Michigan college.

A complete list of graduates for the spring semester will be published when it has been finally approved by the college.

Schoolcraft hikes tuition

A tuition increase, which for most Schoolcraft College students will average \$12 a semester, will take effect in the fall semester.

The board, on a 5-2 vote last week, approved a \$1.50 increase in resident tuition to \$18.50 per credit hour.

A college spokesman said the typical Schoolcraft student who takes eight credit hours a semester will pay \$157 in tuition next fall, which includes student activities and registration fees. The same student paid \$145 under the current tuition rate.

TRUSTEES Harry Greenleaf, Nanci Blatt, Rosina Raymond, Richard Hayward and Leonard Wozniak voted for the tuition hike.

Trustees Mark McQuesten and Michael Burley, who favored a different increase, voted no.

Non-resident student tuition was also increased \$1.50 to \$29 per credit hour.

Burley and McQuesten favored an increase in resident tuition to \$19 per credit hour and non-resident to \$28.

Residents are students from the K-12 school districts of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville, Plymouth-Canton and a small part of Novi.

McQuesten favored a smaller increase in non-resident tuition to put Schoolcraft "in a more competitive position" with neighboring community colleges.

HAYWARD RESPONDED that non-resident students are more attracted by a college's program than lower tuition. "If you have the program and that's what they want, they'll pay it (higher tuition)," he said.

The two community colleges with which Schoolcraft competes for students have lower non-resident tuition rates.

Wayne County Community College has a \$25 per-credit-hour rate, while Henry Ford Community College (HFCC) in Dearborn charges out-of-district students \$23 per credit hour, for up to 10 hours, and \$22 for more than 10 hours.

Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote said WCCC's out-of-district tuition will likely increase. HFCC is considering a \$1 per credit hour increase in non-resident tuition for next fall.

Oakland Community College will charge out-of-district students \$26.50 per credit hour next fall.

IN OTHER ACTION, trustees:

- Approved an estimated \$15,000 bill for repair of a leaky gas main discovered on the Schoolcraft campus April 15.
- Approved a \$14,794 book security system for the college library.
- Increased payment for annual physical examinations for the college's 11 top administrators \$25 to a maximum of \$275.

Pressuring vets win stay for counselor

Under pressure from student veterans, Schoolcraft College has agreed to keep its full-time veterans counselor through June 30.

However, the Schoolcraft Veterans Club, recently organized due to the impending closing of the veterans counselor office, wants a commitment that the college will apply for federal funding to keep the office open longer.

PRESIDENT C. Nelson Grote has proposed the school's counseling office handle veterans counseling, a decision opposed by the veterans group.

The group contends the school will be replacing the full-time veteran's counselor with a part-time service.

At last Wednesday's Board of Trustees meeting, Grote and a spokesman for the veterans differed over an apparent tentative agreement the two had reached earlier in the day.

Grote said he would consider applying for an estimated \$12,000 in federal VCIP (Veterans Cost of Instruction Program) funds, but added: "I'm not going to take an oath that we're going to apply for it."

Veterans Club spokesman Thomas Ontko, a Schoolcraft student, claimed that Grote had made a "firm commitment" earlier in the day to apply for the VCIP funds.

But Grote told trustees he was "not willing to make a commitment that we will."

He said accepting the funds may mean the college has to keep a full-time separate veterans counselor. Since last summer Grote has wanted the office merged with the counseling department.

The veterans office was scheduled to be closed Friday and full-time counselor John Borenski, of Plymouth Township, was to be laid off.

GROTE SAID Borenski will remain on the job the next two months to train other counselors on the federal veterans programs.

Ontko said the vets club needed more than two months to investigate other funding sources for a separate counselor.

"This two month time period does not give the veterans a chance to pursue an alternative," he said.

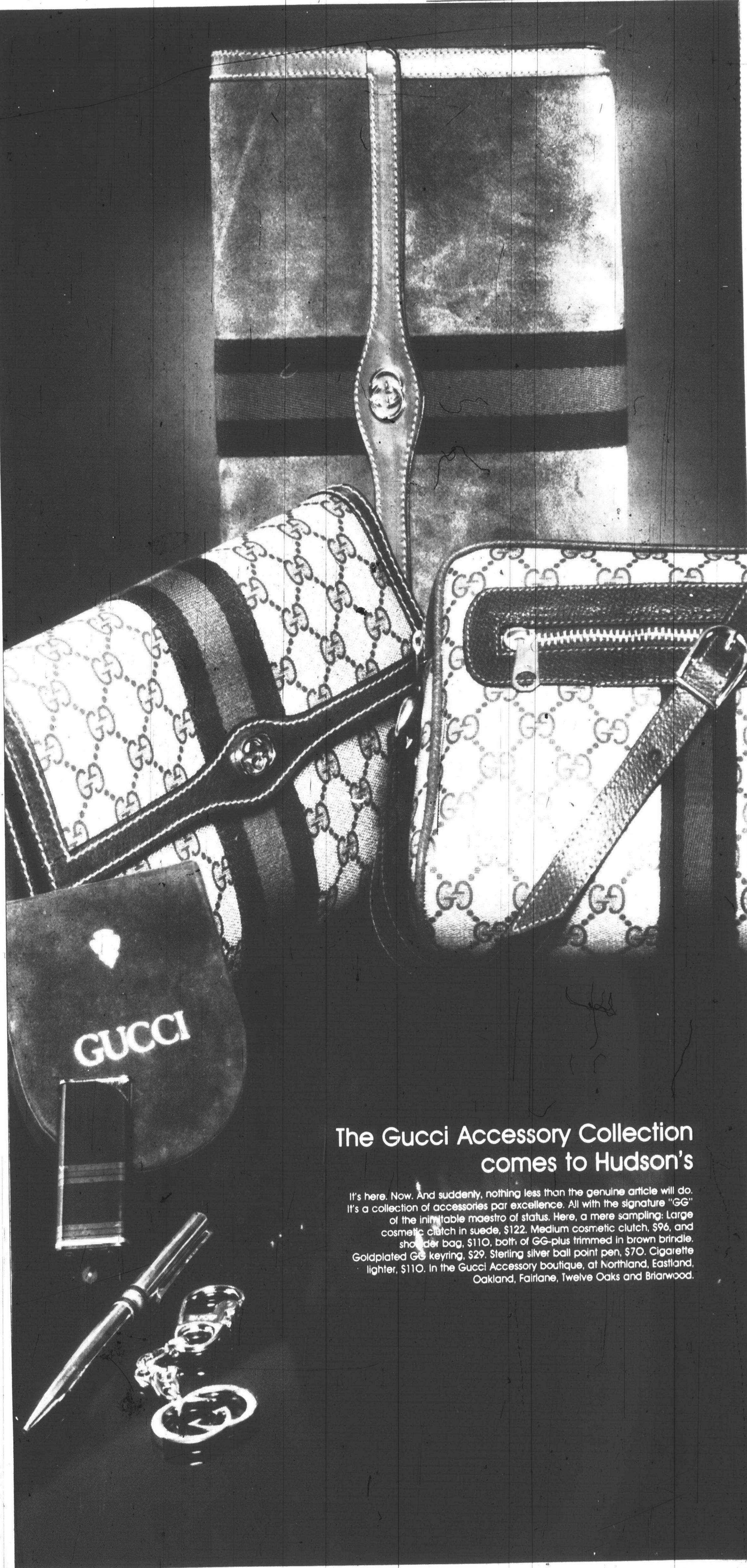
But Ontko found little support among Schoolcraft trustees, who maintain the service is being transferred, not cut.

"There's no way there's any intent to cut down on the services," said Trustee Richard Hayward. He said that if the name of the veterans counseling office had been kept intact with the proposed transfer, he doubted if the veterans would be opposing it.

SCHOOLCRAFT HAS applied for VCIP funds since the early 1970s. College officials say the amount of federal funding has decreased each year since 1976 because the school's veterans enrollment has decreased.

They say the demand no longer justifies continuing a separate full-time counselor.

Grote said it will cost the college \$3,400 to keep the veterans office open through June.

Here is good news for automobile owners.

Thanks to the untiring work of John A. Main, who lives in Plymouth, and James Evans of Ypsilanti, a wheel rim has been invented that will allow you to drive for miles on a flat tire.

Both men are employed at the Kelsey-Hayes plant in Romulus, and they have been granted a U.S. patent for what has been termed a "wheel rim."

In explaining the patent, Main said a pneumatic tire of the tubeless type includes an inner circumferential bead and an outer circumferential bead which, when the tire is mounted, are located in "seats" that are formed on the wheel rim and are terminated in outwardly extending flanges.

When the tire is inflated, the beads are held in their respective seats by the

internal pressure within the tire.

The Plymouth inventor, who has lived here for the past four years, smiled when his attention was called to his latest honor.

"This is only one of several patents I have received during the 20 years I have been working at Kelsey-Hayes," he said.

A graduate of the University of Michigan with the class of '49, he has followed a career as an advanced engineer. While his latest patent concerns an automobile wheel, he also has spent much time on brake discs and other equipment.

One of the features of the latest patent is that you can run on a flat. This is done by having the "beads" cooperate in such a way as to prevent the tire from leaving the rim in the event of a "run flat" condition.

In this way, the flat can be driven for untold miles until it can be serviced.

"I have driven a flat 164 miles on a rough road at our testing grounds," Main said, "and there was no trouble."

"In fact, there has been a case reported when a driver went across the entire country on the flat and there was no harm done."

Obviously, Main said, how long the tire will operate in an uninflated state depends upon how long the "beads" remain seated properly on the wheel rim while the vehicle is being operated during such an emergency.

Main said he and his partner have worked for the past two or three years on the "beaded" theory, and now finally it has been approved with a patent.

They have turned the patent over to the Kelsey-Hayes Company.

A Canton superintendent? Well worth study

Should Canton have a township superintendent? For a number of local people, the idea is certainly worth exploring.

The concept of creating a position for a township superintendent, whose duties would be similar in scope to those of a city manager, was the subject of a panel discussion held at Cyprus Gardens restaurant earlier in the week.

Like most proposals, hiring a township superintendent would come complete with drawbacks.

On the whole, however, the plan has considerable merit.

Although the persons elected to serve on the township board and as administrators usually mean well, voters have no guarantee that any of these officials will be qualified or capable of managing the complexities of government.

There are no minimum qualifications for elected

officials. Voters have to attempt to choose the best candidate from an often limited field.

The elected official system means that even persons who are good administrators may not remain long in office.

A hired superintendent, however, is trained in the administration of municipalities. He or she should have a working knowledge of government finance, employee contracts, legal constraints, budgets and public services.

A superintendent may not be able to escape politics entirely — it would be naive to think so.

Although a person in this position doesn't have to depend on the whims of the voters, he or she does have to answer to the elected officials.

City managers and township superintendents have been fired by elected boards for doing little more than expressing the wrong political attitude.

But essentially, a superintendent is more removed from the campaigning on a day-to-day basis than an elected counterpart. In a community such as Canton, which has a high turnover of elected officials, consistency should be welcomed.

Canton's board of trustees has been crying that the treasurer's department is understaffed. The township's finance director, Mike Gorman, is already overworked, yet continues to have new duties and responsibilities heaped on his shoulders. (In fact Gorman takes on many of the tasks that would normally be delegated to a superintendent.)

An efficient superintendent could help ease this burdens without removing authority from the elected board.

The board would still be in charge and continue to make the resolutions. The superintendent would help carry the directions out.

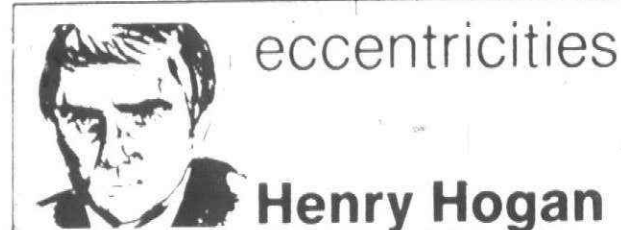
It does not seem a frightening concept, yet some township elected officials appear threatened by the proposal. Perhaps they feel threatened by the possibility their power will be usurped. Perhaps they don't want anyone — including an expert — telling them what should be done.

Perhaps they simply don't want to cough up the usually healthy salary of a superintendent.

Whatever the reason, controversy about the proposal exists. The panel discussion held last week, which was organized by former planning commissioner Bart Berg, was a good start to a potentially touchy issue.

The board should take the proposal to heart and seriously effort to consider hiring a superintendent.

The board members may find such a person will prove just as helpful to them as he or she can be in keeping the wheels of government turning smoothly.

A faster way to elect our chief exec

Every four years, the American people go through an exercise called "electing the president." It is a complicated and expensive process that is both wasteful and time-consuming.

The U.S. Constitution provides for the election of the chief executive by the Electoral College, not by the people.

The framers of the Constitution had no intention of putting this grave responsibility in the hands of an "uninformed" electorate. One delegate to the Constitutional Convention said an election by the people would be like referring a "trial of colours to a blind man."

THE ELECTORAL College was envisioned by the framers as a kind of elite gathering in which the most distinguished and talented persons in the various states would participate. These electors would deliberate and cast an informed and independent vote for the president.

Where originally the members of the Electoral College were selected by the state legislatures, today we have a hodge-podge system that can easily thwart the will of the people.

In Michigan, the Democrats select most of their delegates to the national convention at congressional district caucuses. A small number are also selected by the state party organization. These delegates then vote to nominate the party's presidential candidate.

The state convention delegates select the slate of electors for November under the name of the presidential candidate.

THE REPUBLICANS select their precinct delegates, who elect state convention delegates, who elect national convention delegates based on the results of the state primary election. There is some question whether such a primary will be held this year.

These national convention delegates vote for a party nominee. Like the Democrats, the Republican state convention delegates pick a slate of electors to run for the Electoral College under the name of the party presidential nominee.

When people go to the polls in November, they are not voting for a presidential candidate but for the party's slate of electors.

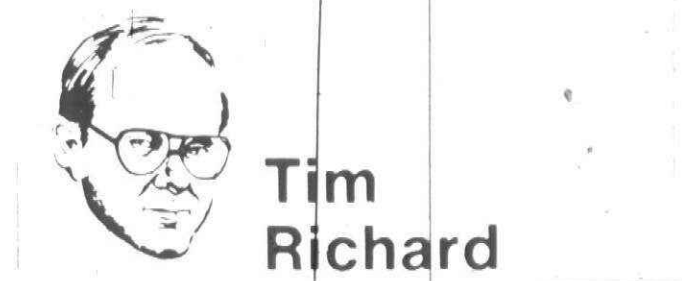
It is a winner-take-all situation. Whatever slate polls the highest number of votes gets to vote the state's entire number of votes for its presidential candidate.

Consequently, a person running for president may receive the majority of the popular vote in the nation and still fail to be elected president.

THE SIMPLER, CHEAPER system would be to have one national primary election, held on the same day throughout the country. This primary would select each party's nominee.

Then a general election would be held in November, and the people themselves would elect their president. The expense of many primaries would be eliminated, the election period would be shortened, the middlemen would be eliminated, and we would have true democracy in the country.

There have been many constitutional amendments floating around providing for this. Because it takes power away from party politicians, they never seem to get passed in Congress.

Who cares what SC pays faculty?

Del Sipes, president of Schoolcraft College's Faculty Forum, wrote us a thoughtful letter the other day objecting to the way we reported administration and faculty salaries of more than \$30,000.

"What purpose does publication of names serve?" he asked. "Is it truly any more informative to the public than a table of pertinent figures? Doesn't it simply satisfy the reader's curiosity to publish names?"

"A name is a fact, but it is generally pertinent to the intent of salary publication."

ACTUALLY, I WAS more than a little surprised that the Michigan Legislature passed a law making individuals' actual earnings public information.

The sponsor of SB 504 last year was none other than western Wayne County's Bill Faust, D-Westland, the Senate majority leader. A former newspaperman with a high regard for education, Faust wrote a bill that's a one-sentence amendment to the 1976 Freedom of Information Act.

It says colleges and school districts "shall upon request make available to the public the salary records of an employee or other official of the institution of higher education, school district, intermediate school district, or community college."

It sailed through the Legislature with little controversy, Faust's staff told me.

The arguments against it were pretty much what Sipes wrote.

The arguments for it, according to the staff analysis, were these:

"Michigan's taxpayers have a right to know how public tax dollars are spent in the State's public schools, colleges and universities. Public access to salary records is an important part of this information, needed to ensure fiscal accountability in this labor-intensive area, and affirmative action progress."

"Review of salary information and appropriate comparisons of individual salaries helps ensure that merit increases are granted reasonably and equitably. Salary information is now available about other public employees, and there is no reason to provide an exemption for school personnel."

FAUST'S BILL was written in the wake of controversies at the University of Michigan, an institution which historically has considered itself a law unto itself, and Lake Superior State College.

It was supported by the American Association of University Professors and the State Board of Education.

Opposed was the Michigan Association of School Administrators.

Personally, I was less than happy with the bill. And reporting salaries smacked of vacuum cleaner journalism.

What tipped the scales in favor of reporting the salaries, however, was the reaction of Schoolcraft staffers to the list of Oakland Community College salaries. They were absolutely fascinated by the data and the names.

Then the Detroit Free Press published top salaries at U-M, showing that Dick Headlee's pal, Prof. Paul McCracken, was at or near the top of the list.

Many persons professed surprise that Schoolcraft instructors made so much. Personally, I am glad to see scholars and inspiring teachers earn some big bucks.

One-sixth of the OCC faculty last year took home more than \$40,000 apiece. I think some of Schoolcraft's faculty deserves the same kind of money.

Happy days are here again?

All the ingredients were there — balloons, badges, boisterous behavior and bombast.

This past weekend, 16,000 Michigan residents gathered to call themselves Democrats for a day. Party faithful called it the party's presidential primary caucus.

In a state where voters pride themselves on being independent, it wasn't surprising that some 30,000 other registered Democrats stayed home.

After all, this is the state where voters cast ballots with equal ardor for a Republican governor and two Democratic U.S. senators.

But the caucus had all the earmarks of a typical Democratic Party function. And in many respects, it was just that — a party.

It made for humorous reading among the less liberal, pipe-smoking, establishment members who spent endless hours waiting for something of significance to happen.

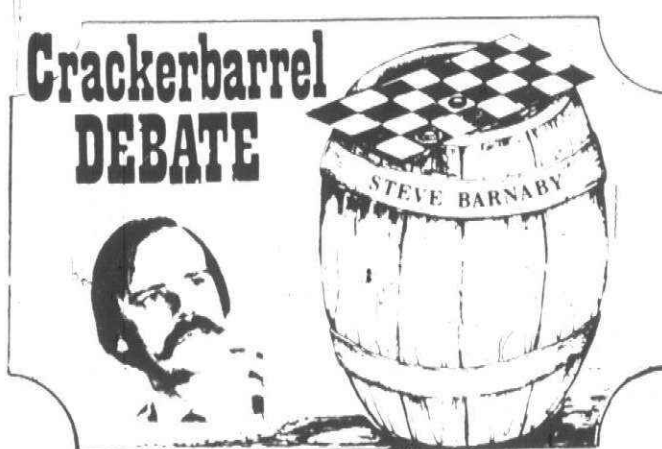
Nothing much did.

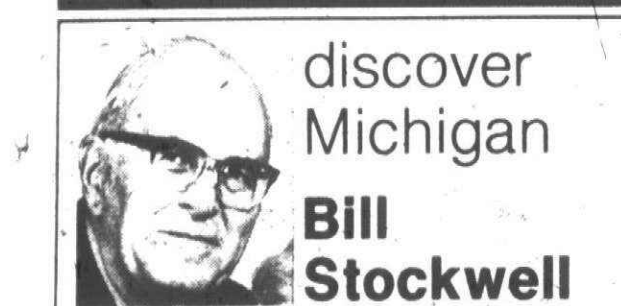

All in one stroke of a day it was boring, exciting, laughable and very political. But most importantly, it worked. By summer's end, we will have two presidential candidates — maybe three.

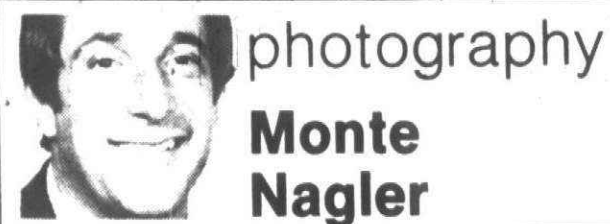
That's enough for anybody's political system.

Planning improves trip photos

Spring is here, and this is the time when folks begin to plan their vacations.

Part of this planning should include preparation for your travel photography.

If you've purchased a new camera, make sure you are thoroughly familiar with all its controls and operations before leaving on your trip. Practice with your equipment. Make certain you can change lenses on a crowded bus or change film on a street corner.

Travel light, if possible, but don't leave a piece of equipment home you might later have wished you had brought. In addition to your basic camera and normal lens, take along a wide angle and moderate telephoto lens (if you have them) or a zoom.

A small flash unit and collapsible tripod may prove invaluable. Make sure all batteries are fresh — you may have a hard time locating them some places away from home.

If you're traveling abroad, it is wise to register your equipment with the Customs Office upon departure to avoid any problems when you return.

TAKE ENOUGH FILM to get you through the trip, usually about one roll per day.

Decide on whether you prefer slides or prints and then select a medium speed film that will enable you to cope with a wide variety of lighting conditions. But take along a couple of rolls of high speed film for those low light situations.

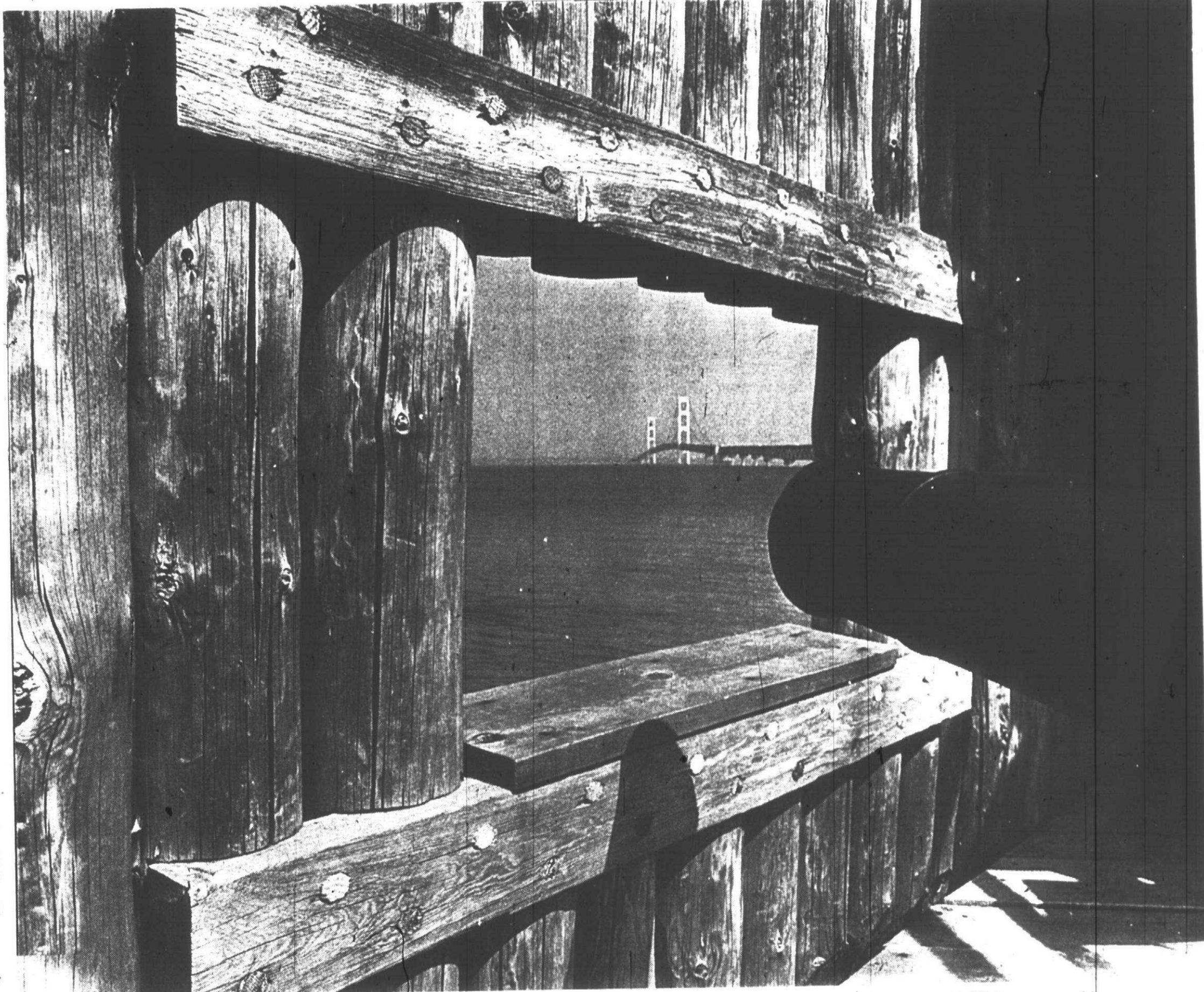
A note on airport X-ray devices: Don't believe the signs! X-ray exposures may definitely harm film. Be sure to use either a film shield bag, or, better yet, request a visual inspection of your film.

Here are some hints for better travel pictures:

- **PLAN before you leave.** Read up on the place you'll be visiting. Study the people, places and customs. Have some ideas beforehand of what you'll want to photograph.

- **Don't pass up pictures on the way.** Many photographic opportunities are missed by ignoring interesting things en route because it is felt better pictures are awaiting at the final destination. Taking photos along the way helps to make your trip complete.

- **Include people in your pictures.** People at work or play are an integral part of any environment especially when engaged in legendary crafts and events. While the subject's permission should be

asked before he or she is photographed, most people are proud of their skills and would not mind the minor intrusion.

- **Avoid staged events.** Real people and real places are better subjects than staged events for the tourists' benefit. "Real" photographs will also help people to understand a country or locale better.

- **Look for the unusual.** While you will certainly want to photograph well known attractions, always

be on the look-out for the unusual or special view. An obscure street scene or other out of the way image should be part of the traveler's vision. Look for the unusual angle or perspective to enhance a familiar subject or show it from a different point of view.

Above all, become involved in your travel photography. Immerse yourself in the customs, work, play, and food of the places you go. Try to bring

home the essence of the places you visit.

Be on the lookout for photographic opportunities and always keep your "traveler's vision" in high gear.

'You take the lumps as they come,' county's lawyer says

In October 1974, an Inkster man died in Wayne County General Hospital after suffering a head injury at the Detroit Race Course in Livonia.

The County Board of Commissioners recently approved paying the man's wife and her attorney \$350,000 in an out-of-court settlement of their medical malpractice suit filed against the county hospital in Westland.

A doctor there had failed to discover a subdural hematoma — a blood clot under the skull. The man died a day and a half after he had been released from the emergency room.

The case is only the forerunner of other expensive settlements the financially strapped county has yet to face. The most expensive suits involve charges of medical malpractice at the hospital, two suicides in the Wayne County Jail, and other suits regarding conditions at the downtown jail.

"THIS \$350,000 is a drop in the bucket to what you're facing," the county's chief lawyer, George Cross, told a county board committee recently.

"This is the tip of the iceberg. There's more coming."

Cross, a Livonia resident, said in a recent interview that the county faces "\$100 million in outstanding liability" from unsettled cases which have been pending for several years.

He admits the unsettled suits are a potential "time bomb" for the county, which hasn't met its annual budgets since the mid-1970s.

"The time bomb is there," said Cross, "except a chain reaction will never go

off — not the same day or same year."

Civil cases in Wayne County Circuit Court now take at least 3½ years, if not longer, to come to trial.

LAST YEAR, which the county ended with an \$18.6 million budget deficit, Cross estimates \$1 million was paid to settle claims.

The county Board of Auditors last week estimated the county could end the current fiscal year with a \$19 million deficit. The auditors said the county faces a total \$2.8 million in liability claims this year.

The county is self-insured and carries no medical malpractice coverage for the hospital.

"You take the lumps as they come," said Cross. "No one else pays the bills except you. The county has to decide whether it's going to eat or pay the judgment when the judgment comes."

Cross, who has been a lawyer for nearly 30 years, said there is a "panic situation developing" nationwide among local governments facing increasingly expensive lawsuits. "Every county wants to reduce liability or prevent it," said Cross, who is on the board of directors of the National Association of County Civil Attorneys.

"WE ARE much below the national average as far as payments are concerned," said Cross, but he added the county has yet to face what could be potentially huge settlements.

A nine-year-old police brutality suit filed against both the county and city of Detroit could cost the county \$2.5 million if a mediation panel's award is up-

held in a trial or the case isn't settled out of court.

Cross said the county initially won the case by citing the old doctrine government immunity, but the 1974 Wayne County Circuit Court decision was overturned last year by the Michigan Supreme Court. The high court ordered the case back to trial.

"(Government) immunity is a thing of the past," said Cross. The result: Lawsuits against governments today are quite common.

"There won't be an end to it until there's an end to sue," said Cross.

He says settlement awards now determined by juries have been "excessive." When he started practicing law, Cross said \$20,000 to \$40,000 settlements in liability cases were considered "exorbitant."

"Now million-dollar verdicts are nickel and dime. They happen all the time."

A CLASS action lawsuit begun in the early 1970s on behalf of Wayne County Jail inmates is still costing the county "a lot of money," Cross said.

The Board of Commissioners recently approved paying the mother of a prisoner who died in June 1972, after being beaten and sexually assaulted by his cell inmates, \$324,300 during the next eight years. The law firm that

represented the inmate's mother, Cockrell, Cooper, Spearman & King, of Detroit, will receive \$150,000 by November of 1981.

The jail suit led to establishment of a three-judge circuit court panel to oversee conditions in the jail and maintain a set level of staffing by sheriff's deputies.

Cross said there are 30 suits pending against the sheriff's department, most regarding the jail.

Suits against the hospital and jail cost the most money, but Cross said workers compensation and mental health cases provide the largest workload for his staff of 16 attorneys.

The county is required to represent the institution or person that seeks to commit a county resident to a state-run mental health hospital.

Cross says he has three attorneys handling 80 mental health cases each (petitions filed to commit a person average 150 a week) and two attorneys handling more than 900 workers compensation cases a year.

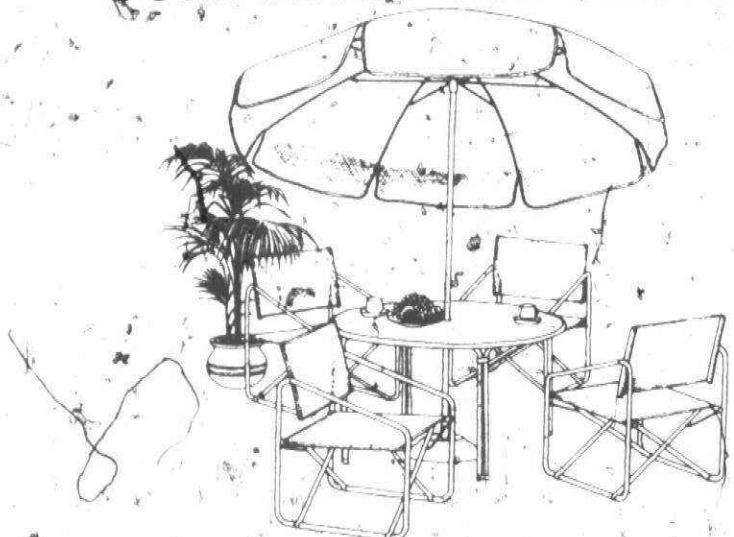
"When you have 450 cases," Cross said, "you can't try many. In effect, you're buying 'em out as cheap as you can."

"If we can take the \$2,000, \$3,000 and \$4,000 cases and get rid of them a month after we get them, we would reduce the number of cases."

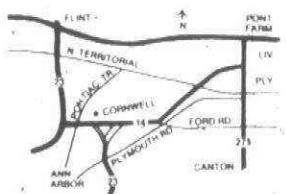

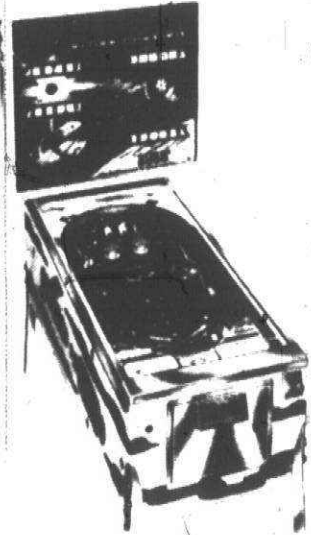

Stevenson eyes Observerland title

Canton, Salem vie

Fourteen high school teams face the almost impossible task of dethroning defending champion Livonia Stevenson Saturday at the 10th annual Observerland Track and Field Relays.

The meet will get underway at 10 a.m. with the pole vault. The remaining field events will start at 11 a.m. The first of nine running events — the four-mile relay — is slated for 2 p.m.

Hilbert Junior High, which is at 26440 Puritan (west of Beech Daly between Five and Six Mile roads), is again the site.

Admission is \$1 for students and \$1.50 for adults. The tickets are good for all day.

Stevenson last year placed first in five events while rolling up 37 points, the largest point-total by any team in the history of the relays.

Just about everyone is back this year for the Spartans. That leads John MacKenzie, the meet director, to believe that Stevenson will likely run away with the title again.

"I think for the first time, I can sit back and say my choice is going to be easy," said MacKenzie, who coached at Redford Union for many years. "I don't want to put the hex on anybody, but Stevenson has to be a heavy favorite."

The Spartans have not lost a dual meet since the 1978 season. Already this year they have won the prestigious Elks Relays.

"Just about every year the (Observerland) competition has come down to the last event or two," said MacKenzie. "But this year, I just see the teams slicing up one another and not going into Stevenson's strength too much."

In addition to Stevenson, the field

will consist of Livonia Bentley, Redford Bishop Borgess, Plymouth Canton, Detroit Catholic Central, Livonia Churchill, Farmington, Livonia Franklin and Farmington Harrison.

Also competing will be Southfield-Lathrup, North Farmington, Northville, Redford Union, Plymouth Salem and Redford Thurston.

MacKenzie said that he would not be surprised if the Spartans rolled up the largest margin of victory in the history of the meet with their large roster of talent spread across all events.

Tom Bills, second-year coach of the Spartans, is confident that his charges will repeat as champions. "I like our chances. If we don't win, it's because our kids laid down," said Bills.

MacKenzie speculated that the real close race of the afternoon will be for second place.

Plymouth Salem, North Farmington, Livonia Churchill, Redford Bishop Borgess and Detroit Catholic Central were all mentioned by MacKenzie as good prospects for the runner-up position in the team standings.

"I saw Salem last week and I was really impressed. They are a well-balanced, strong team," said MacKenzie. "North Farmington has good talent on the team and Churchill, with the numbers and coaching, always will be competitive."

"Borgess will be good in the shot and CC has good distance runners," MacKenzie said, adding that he really doesn't

know that much about either's personnel.

As for potential records to be broken, MacKenzie said that it all depends on the weather. Hilbert Junior High has one of the last cinder tracks in the area, so rain could make for mud and slower times.

"It all depends on who goes after them (the records)," MacKenzie added. "Coaches can either spread or concentrate their strength."

The records most likely to be shattered, according to MacKenzie, are:

- The time of 2:28.0 in the sprint medley set in 1975 by Stevenson. The Spartans could break their own record this weekend.

- The time of 8:17 in the four-mile relay set in 1977 by Churchill. Catholic Central could break the record if it stacks the event with its "quality distance people."

- The two-mile relay time of 8:07.8 set in 1972 by Salem. Stevenson's excellent crew of 880 runners have a good shot at setting a new mark.

- The long jump relay aggregate distance of 50-7½ set in 1973 by Stevenson. Farmington High has three jumpers who have leaped better than 20 feet this spring.

MacKenzie added that any of the distance records could be broken with good weather and a fast track.

Scoring is based on five points for first place, four for second, three for third, two for fourth and one for fifth in every event.

Three people from each team will compete in the field events. Their best height or distance will be added together and then tallied for team scoring.

Four runners from each team will compete in the track events.

Chief softball squad thwarted by Franklin in OH

Foiled in nightcap

It was a nightmare for coach Max Somerville and the Plymouth Canton girls' softball team Saturday.

The Chiefs blew an eight-run final inning lead in the second game of a doubleheader against Livonia Franklin and lost their first game of the season, 13-12. The Chiefs won the opener despite another shaky seventh inning, 8-6.

"We blew it," said Somerville. "It was a nightmare. You can't expect to win games with that many walks."

The Chiefs just couldn't get any Patriots out in the bottom half of the seventh inning.

The Chiefs had built up a 12-4 advantage heading into the last half of the seventh when disaster struck. Marianne Pink came in to relieve Cindy Sovine with nobody out in the seventh. Pink was saddled with the loss after pitching to only six batters, all of whom reached base. She is now 3-1.

"We lost our concentration there at the end," Somerville said as Franklin scored seven unearned runs in the final frame.

The Chiefs collected only six hits in the second game with two each coming

from the bats of Vicky Cavallaro and Pam Schipani. Franklin had five hits.

IN THE FIRST game, Canton almost folded in the last inning again, but held on to preserve the win. Pink was the winner and Sovine got credit for the save.

The Chiefs broke open a 1-1 tie in the sixth inning when they exploded for four runs thanks to some timely hitting and three walks. Canton also scored three more times in the top of the seventh to make it a seven run cushion, 8-1.

Franklin, 4-1 overall aided by six walks, came storming back to score five times to almost pick up the sweep. "Our fielding wasn't bad, but our lack of concentration hurt us in both games," said Somerville. "We've got a fine team. We just didn't play well."

Somerville was not very happy with the umpire and complained about his inconsistency behind the plate.

"The ump was terrible," said Somerville. "He was very inconsistent for both sides."

Cavallaro and Pink led Canton with two hits apiece in improving the Chiefs record to 4-1.

Thrill of Boston lures area runners

I've always marveled at persons who jog or run on a regular basis.

And I really have to admire those brave few who participate in marathon events.

Recently I learned that three persons from Plymouth ran in the last Boston Marathon.

David Stoller, 45, an engineer who has been a resident of Plymouth for only a year, competed in his third marathon. Dr. Fred Holappa and his wife, Karen, also finished the grueling 26-mile, 285-yard event.

For Fred it was his fifth marathon. It was Karen's second.

Ironically, Holappa and Stoller finished just two seconds apart and do not know each other. It was more than a mere coincidence that the two Plymouth runners finished right together in a field of 5,000.

"I've never met the man, but maybe we should start training together," said Stoller.

"I vaguely remember the name," said Holappa. "I don't believe we've ever met."

Both runners agreed that competing in the Boston Marathon is a tremendous thrill.

"It's like a 26-mile long family," said Stoller. "It's just a fantastic experi-

ence. I think the spirit and the tradition will live on forever.

The opportunity is well worth it for the participants and the spectators.

HOLAPPA echoed Stoller's sentiments.

"There's something magical about it," he said. "It's a tough route, and to compete, you have to pay your dues. There's something about the crowd."

Stoller agreed that the thousands of spectators who line the course are just "a great group of people."

"They line up three or four deep from start to finish," he said. "People give you water, ice and orange slices along the way."

Stoller qualified for the race with a time of 3 hours 7 minutes in the Detroit Free Press Marathon last October. His time in the Boston Marathon was 3:22:10.

"The terrain was very difficult," said Stoller, who competed in the Masters Class (40 and over). "Boston is very hilly. It's a unique course with a lot of downgrades. That puts a strain on your legs."

"I'm still getting over the soreness. It'll take about a week."

"I did a lot of swimming to loosen up my legs," said Holappa. "It's best to rest. The heat that day had an effect on the times. I've run outdoors all winter long. It was quite a change."

Holappa's wife did some light jogging the day after the race.

She trails at the Ann Arbor Track Club along with her husband. The Plymouth doctor averages about 70 miles a week in preparation for the race. Stoller, who trains on his own, averages about 12 miles per day.

STOLLER SAID it took him two minutes to reach the starting line. With 5,000 runners starting out, things can get pretty congested.

"The streets are very narrow," he said. "It takes several miles before you get some running room. Everyone is pretty orderly for that size of group."

The Plymouth engineer was urged on by his wife and relatives at the finish line.

"Those people were rooting me on," Stoller said. "They are staunch supporters. I could hear my wife when I was running down that long grade. She gave out a big war cry. It was the end of a long ordeal."

Holappa comes back to Boston every year not only to compete in the race, but also to attend a convention of the American Medical Joggers.

The Holappas and Stoller intend to return to Boston next year.

And did any of the three runners see Rosie Ruiz, the controversial winner of the women's title who was later disqualified?

"My kids climbed up a tree and saw all the winners," said Holappa. "They saw Rogers and all the great ones. The people I talked to said Ruiz just looked too fresh at the finish."

Primeau shutout earns Rock split

Plymouth Salem divided a twin bill Saturday with Royal Oak Kimball.

The Rocks were nipped in the first game, 6-5, but came back to win the nightcap, 6-0.

Senior lefty Jeff Primeau scattered seven hits in leading Salem to the shutout in the second game. He walked four and struck out six enroute to his first victory of the season.

"He seemed to always get out the jams," said Salem coach Brian Gilles. "Jeff pitched pretty well. He got his curve over and walked only four."

A three-run homer by freshman catcher Dave Slavin was all Primeau really needed to post the win. Jim An-

derson led off with a walk and Mike Woodard reached base on an infield error to set up Slavin's shot.

"It was in right-center over the 355-foot mark," recalled Gilles. "Dave hit the ball like a rocket."

Balle added three insurance runs in the sixth.

Anderson led off with a single and made second on a stolen base. Woodard followed with a single and Pat McNamara walked to load the bases. Slavin got credit for an RBI with a ground out.

Outfielder Joe Garcia then hit a double to score McNamara and Woodard.

IN THE FIRST game, Salem jumped out to a 3-1 lead.

Brian Lewandowski, swinging a hot bat of late, led off with a single and Mitch Wilcox walked.

Anderson came up and knocked in both runners with a double. Woodard sent home Anderson with a single.

Scoring single runs in the first and second innings, Kimball closed the gap to 3-2.

Kimball tallied four runs in the fifth to take a 6-3 margin.

In the Salem half of the sixth, Anderson collected his second double. He scored on Woodard's second hit, another double, cutting the advantage to 6-4.

In the bottom of the seventh, McNamara doubled and went to third on a wild pitch. Slavin walked and cru-

ised into second on a wild pitch, scoring McNamara. The Rocks, however, could not muster up one more run despite no outs.

"Errors kind of hurt us," said Gilles. "I was real pleased with (Jim) Jimmerson's performance. He had some tough luck."

Paul Stevenson, a senior, started for the Rocks. He threw 2½ innings, allowing two runs on two hits.

Jimmerson finished up. He went 4½ innings, giving up four runs on six hits.

Lewandowski, Anderson and Woodard paced the Salem attack with two hits each. Anderson scored twice and batted home two runs. The Rocks committed four errors.

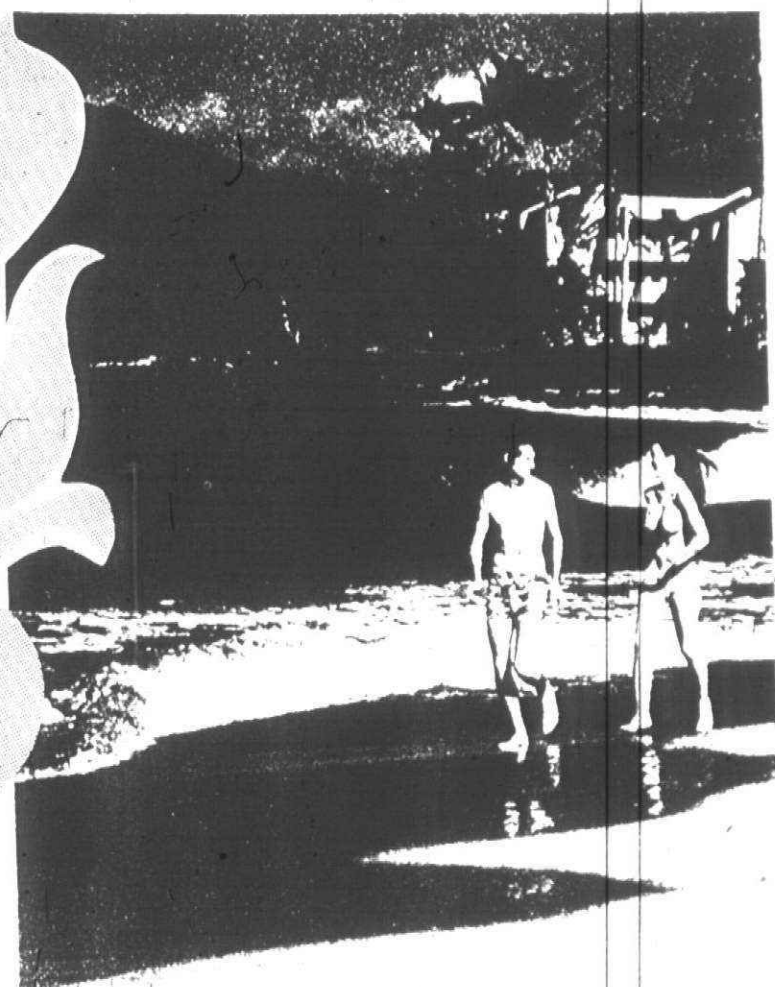

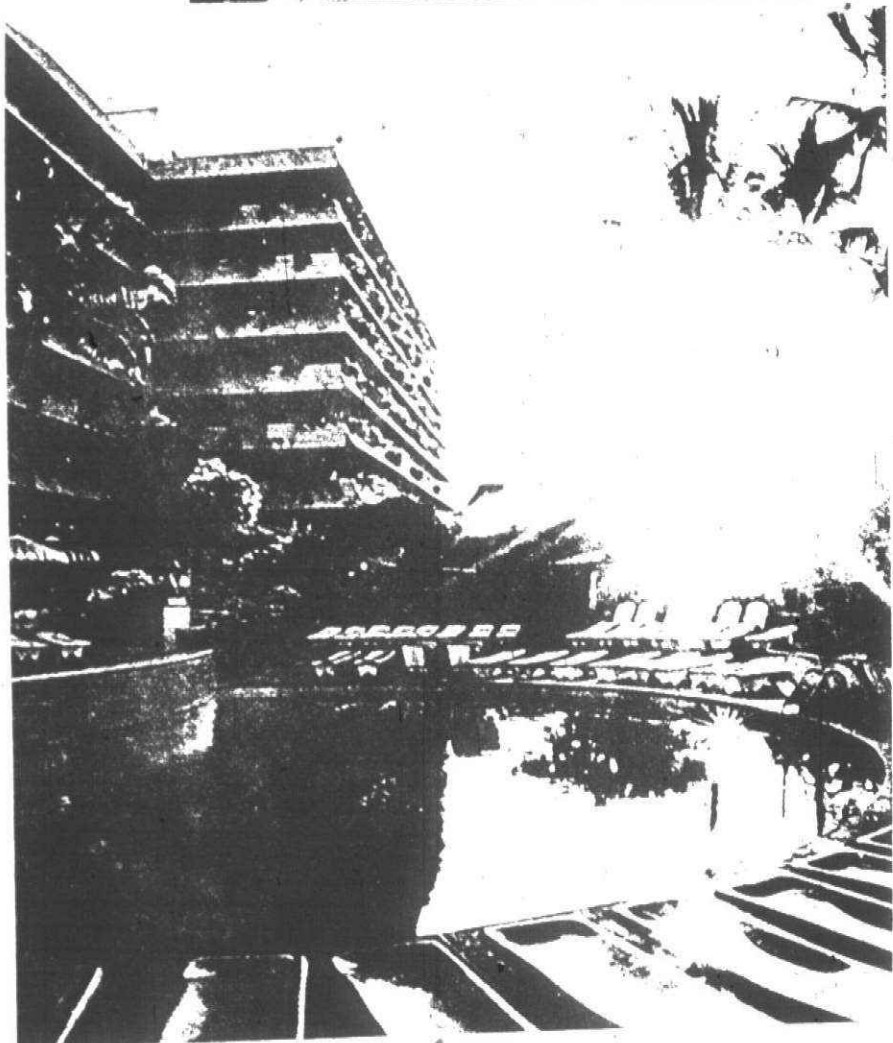

Johan van der Merwe is conductor

Johan van der Merwe was named conductor of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra at the annual dinner meeting of the Plymouth Symphony Society Monday night.

The announcement that a decision had been reached followed months of deliberation by the Plymouth Symphony Board of Directors and consultation with the members of the orchestra. Wayne Dunlap, conductor of the symphony for 28 years, announced his retirement last May and once the word was out applications for the position were directed to the symphony board.

The 1979-80 season was completed with a series of guest conductors and van der Merwe conducted the March concert. He is on the faculty of the School of Music at the University of Michigan and is associate professor of voice at the University of Toledo.

His background is international. THE NEW MAESTRO of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra was born in Pretoria, South Africa. He obtained his bachelor's of music degree at the University of Cape Town.

He studied at the Royal Academy of Music in London, England on an Associated Board Scholarship and was awarded the Ernest Read Conductor's prize in 1960. He continued his studies in Germany, Italy and America.

His academic teaching career started while he was still in Germany at the

Hochschule fur Musik in Cologne. As associate professor and dean of applied music at the University of Pretoria, he was guest conductor of the Johannesburg Symphony Orchestra and the National Radio Symphony Orchestra and the Orchestra of the Arts Council in the Transvaal.

In 1961 he was appointed conductor and chorus master at the South African Broadcasting Corporation in Johannesburg. During this time he conducted many concerts, both public and studio recordings with the SABC Symphony Orchestra. Numerous concert tours throughout South Africa followed and he conducted several first performances of South African composers' works.

IN 1960 HE founded the 100-voice Radio Choir which appeared with great success in symphony and choral concerts, also with Stravinsky when he visited South Africa in 1962.

His activities in Europe have included opera as coach and Hamburg State Opera, coach and conductor at the opera in Holland, and the operas in Saarbrücken and Wuppertal in Germany.

He was first prize winner in the 1966 Competition. As a result, he appeared as guest conductor in Liverpool, Germany, Holland and South Africa.

This summer, he will be director of the U-M orchestra and the opera production at the National Music Camp at

Interlochen. He also will conduct summer opera in Ann Arbor.

Earlier this year, he was in South Africa where he and his wife, a singer, made recordings for radio. They have

been invited back for a season of concerts and recordings with the National Symphony in Johannesburg in 1981.

Van der Merwe has been hired for the 1980-81 season.

Following the annual meeting, Fran Lang entertained the new conductor board members and their wives at an informal reception at her Powell Road home.

Museum has bridal gowns from 1850-1960

Although weddings have been with us for centuries, styles of wedding gowns have changed from year to year, in keeping with times and fashions.

This is evident from a display, "Brides of Yesteryear," now at the Plymouth Historical Museum.

The museum is open every Thursday, Saturday and Sunday, from 1 to 4 p.m. There is an admission charge of \$1 for adults.

The exhibit spans the years from the 1850s to the 1960s.

In the 1850s, when Plymouth and Michigan, were still largely rural and frontier, practicality was the keynote. One 1856 dress is a subdued gray, decorated for the occasion with a crisp little apron, shawl and cap, all hand-embroidered.

TWO OTHERS are from the same pattern. Both are in plaids with little lace collars. One is green; the other, brown. Plaids were popular at this time because of the influence of the Queen Victoria and her love of vacationing in Scotland.

Up until the 1890s, wedding gowns were designed to be "best dresses," after the wedding, although the materials were rich, of satin and velvet, the colors were dark and serviceable, such as the plum-colored model on display at the museum.

Two dresses, from the turn of the century, were worn for graduation ceremonies as well as weddings, according to museum records.

It was not until the late 1890s, that the brides chose white or ecru dresses, obviously intended to be worn only at weddings, although there were still exceptions. One is the 1910 Edwardian model that would have been chic for any occasion.

IN THE 1920s, there is also a notable exception to the gown we have come to consider traditional for weddings. This is the bright pink, knee-length, dropped-waist style of the flapper bride. She looks as if she's all set to Charleston down the aisle, twirling her knee-length pearls as she goes.

The wedding gown of the 1960s is of white satin, with a long veil and flowing train.

In addition to the gowns, exhibits chairman Rita Maly has set up a display of wedding gifts in the museum's Victorian rooms.

Such things as a pearl-handled fish set, napkin holders, a blue bride's basket, egg holders, a cruet set, and carefully-embroidered linens were things no bride could be without.

There is also a "Good Housekeeping Book of Menus, Recipes and Household Discoveries" from the 1920s, along with a flatiron.

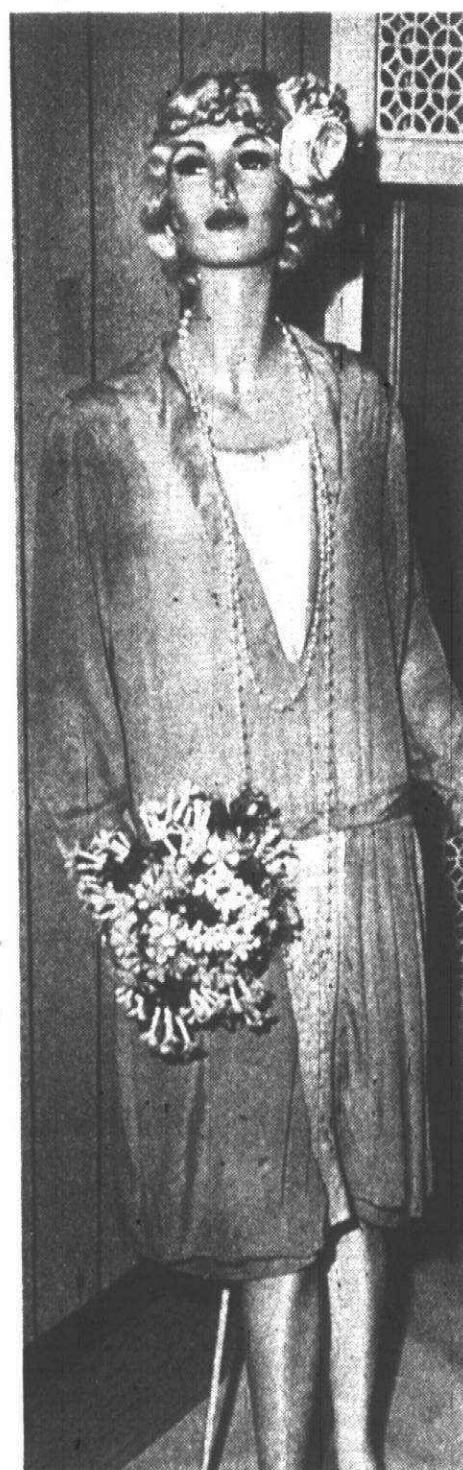

It's not a bird or a plane. It's a blimp

From time to time, this column will highlight products that in some way assist adults in their parenting role, assist youngsters in their childhood role, or help parents and children to have fun together.

Two sights follow the onset of spring as surely as B follows A in the alphabet. The first is the sight of a child running valiantly down a hillside, a ball of string in one hand, while the other hand gingerly grasps a diamond-shaped bit of cloth or paper at the end of an outstretched arm. The second sight is that same child, still clutching that bit of material, sitting forlornly on the curb — no wind.

An Italian company has come out with the answer to a kite's flyer's nemesis. Called UFO Solar, it is a non-kite requiring no wind at all. This airship regards wind as a rival.

Actually a non-rigid dirigible, or blimp, this airship resembles a very lightweight, large, black, garbage bag. When closed at one end, it can be inflated by holding it open and running. Once the blimp is filled with air, tie off the other end, attach the accompanying cable, stand it in the sunlight, and wait.

AFTER A FEW MOMENTS, the airship will begin to rise. Simply let out the cable as the ship goes up. Keep careful hold of the cable, for the company warns that the blimp is capable of

reaching extraordinary altitudes (30,000 feet). However, only a 60-foot cord is enclosed.

After testing this product on a less than favorable day, we discovered that it truly is intended for use on windless days. The cable grip is too flimsy to be trusted on gusty days. Also, the airship is so light, wind causes it to whip about. However, the children had such a good time trying to stay out of it's way.

Unlike kites that are usually ruined when torn, the non-kite was fun. We discovered that this airship can be easi-

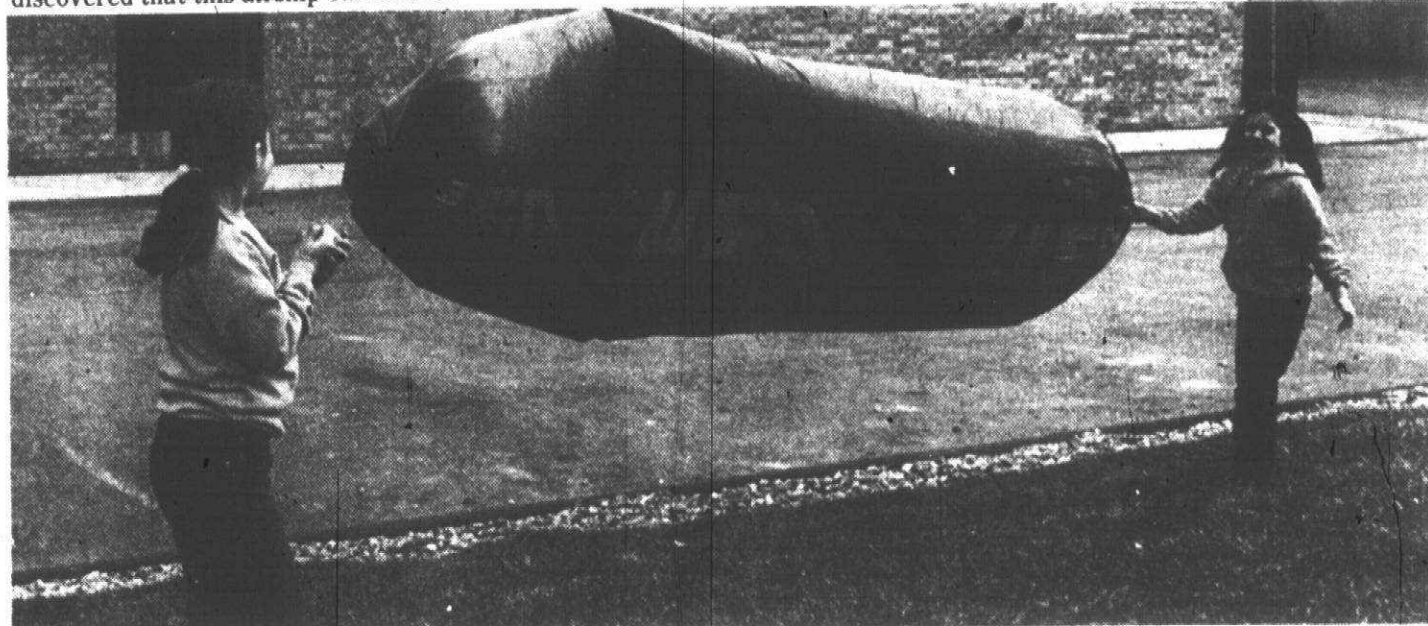
ly repaired with transparent tape.

Properly used, this blimp should provide a lot of fun, with the added benefit of changing the perception of what a kite is, and what the proper conditions are for it's use.

BY THE WAY, the blimp works on the principle of convection heating. The sunlight heats the air inside the bag, causing the air to expand. The expanding air is lighter than the surrounding cooler air, causing the blimp to rise. The UFO Solar can be found at area

toy and hobby shops and some children's bookshops. Cost \$5. Caution: Like other plastic bags, keep out of reach of unattended children.

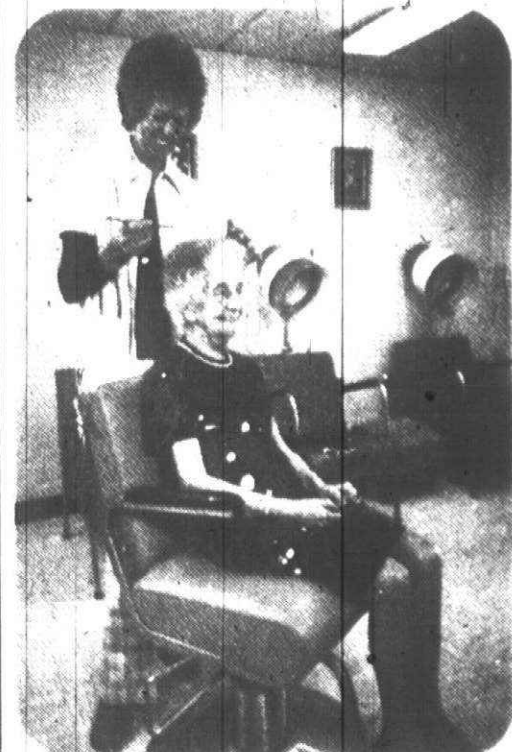
Pops program: Strauss to Sousa

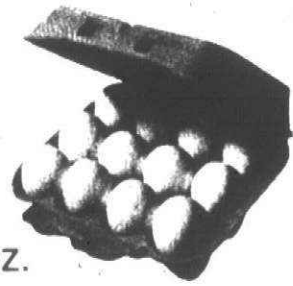

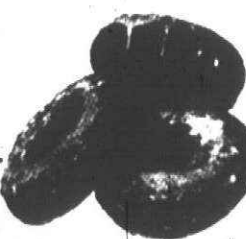

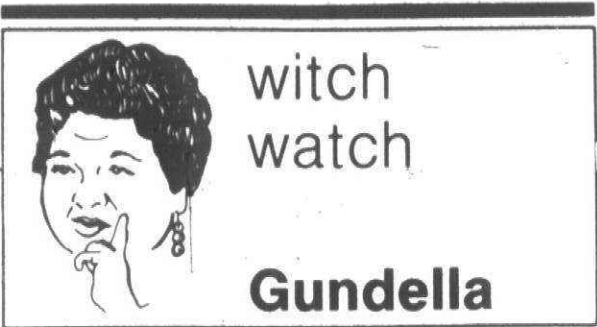

Dreaming of death? Change is coming

Dear Gundella: What does it mean to dream of death?

Dear Lois,

This dream could have many different meanings, and to really interpret it correctly, I would have to know more of the details. However, death is usually the symbol of the ending of one condition and the beginning of another. For instance, a mother dreamed of the death of her daughter when the daughter was graduating from high school, and about to leave home for the first time. Another person dreamed of a death at the time that he was changing careers.

Neither of these were omens of tragedy, but only symbols of change.

Dear Gundella: I dream of being with my mother, who is dead. Does this mean I am about to die?

Dear Robert,

It is not unusual or strange for a person who once was a very important part of your life, but who is now dead, to appear in your dreams.

It would be helpful to know the events of the dream: what was taking place, or what was being said.

The dead person is usually a symbol, not of death, but of what that person stood for in your life while they were living.

Do these dreams take place at a time when you, in your waking hours, are living or behaving in a way that would cause your mother to strongly approve or disapprove?

There is also another possibility. Sometimes we wake up knowing that we have dreamed about a loved one who is no longer with us, but we can't remember anything else about the dream.

In these cases, the dreamer may actually be communicating with the spirit of that loved one while sleeping. This is not a true dream, but a real happening.

How you find out about water quality

We live on a lake and are very worried about the health of the lake. Where can we go for help to determine the quality of the water.

H.M., Bloomfield Hills

The Department of Natural Resources has a cooperative program involving lake residents in determining water quality. The program, known as the self-help water quality monitoring program, involves taking transparency measurements weekly and water samples every other week, from the first of May through the middle of September.

Lakes which show water quality problems might then be eligible for a limited assistance program involving the participation of lake residents and associations in determining the reasons for their lake problems, including technical advice on how to correct the problems. Programs are also available to help rehabilitate lakes

with severe problems.

Associations or individuals concerned with the water quality of any lake, large or small, are invited to participate in the Self-Help Program. For more information on this or other lake problems contact the Division of Land Resource Programs, Inland Lake Management Unit, P.O. Box 30028, Lansing, 48909.

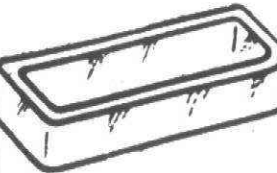

Child care firms tour Canton High

A number of representatives from child care businesses in the Plymouth-Canton community recently attended an open house at Canton Corner, the child care vocational program of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The open house was sponsored by the skills for living teachers at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP), including Sue Visser, child care instructor, Lois Santer, nursery school instructor, Carey Schwartz, Judy McKay and Jan Williams.

The purpose of the open house was to generate support and enthusiasm for a cooperative training program between the child care program at the CEP and the local child care firms.

About 50 high school students are enrolled in the child care program at Canton Corner which is used by about 80 preschoolers. The program is so popular, says Ms. Visser, that it already is filled up for the fall of 1980. The center has been operated at the CEP for about 6½ years now.

"Our primary goal is to provide interested students the training to gain employment in the child care occupations," explains Harold Gaertner, director of career and vocational education for the school district.

"Our laboratory centered curriculum has grown over the years and has in-

voked a great deal of interest on the part of the students. Our concern at this point is how to improve the work experience portion of the program for our students."

Gaertner explained that the open house was held to acquaint local business persons who operate child care businesses with the child care and cooperative training programs at the high schools.

The child care center also is used by the child development, health, psychology, and sociology classes for observational purposes to study behavior and development sequences.

Students enrolled in child care classes receive two credits toward high school graduation.

Among those attending the open house were: Connie Flynn of Canton Crickets; Dottie Wright of Story Book Gardens We Care; Wilma Arnold of the PLUS program; Pat Patton, skills for living coordinator from the CEP; Cris Johnston, teacher, of pre-vocational classes; Carole Schwall, a vocational counselor/coordinator; Dorothy Sincok, vocational technician, distributive education; Larry Masteller of Kidie Campus and Continuing Education; Keith Baughman, cooperative coordinator, business and industry; and Gaertner.



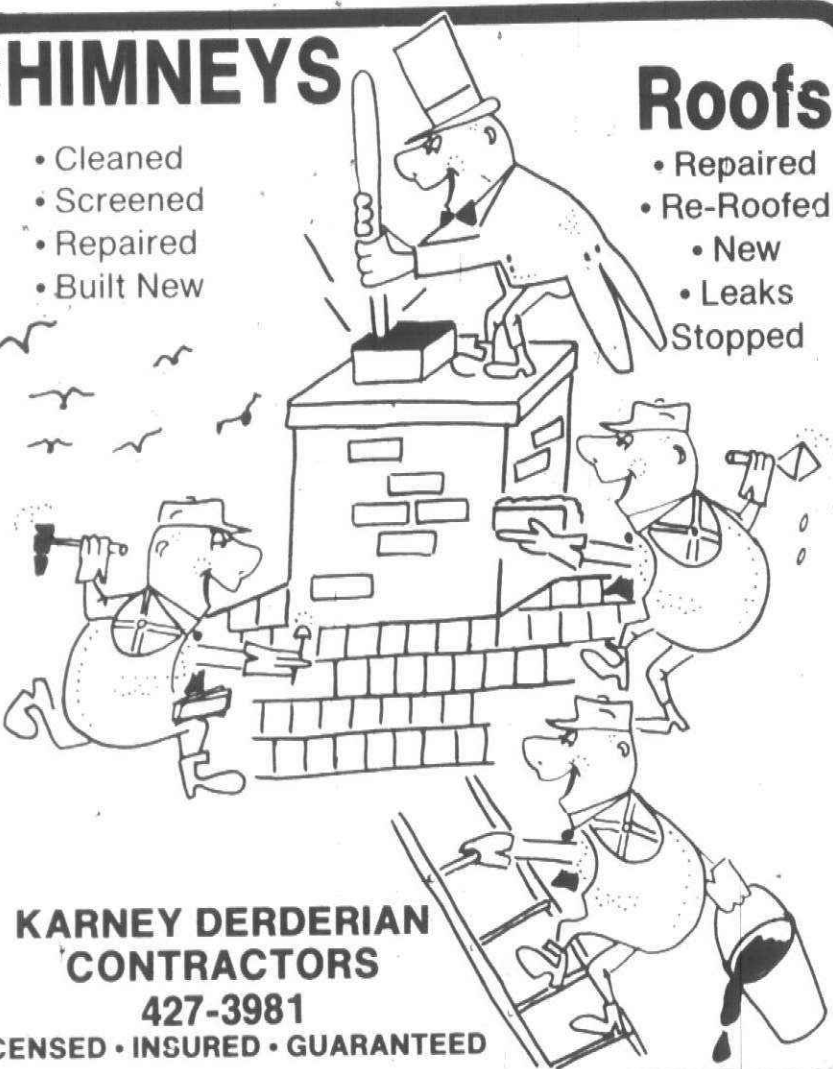

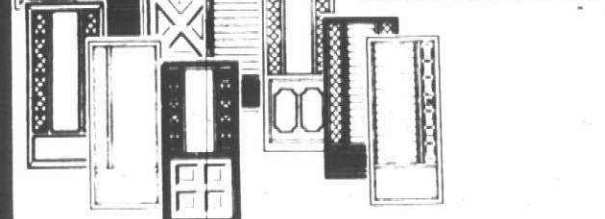

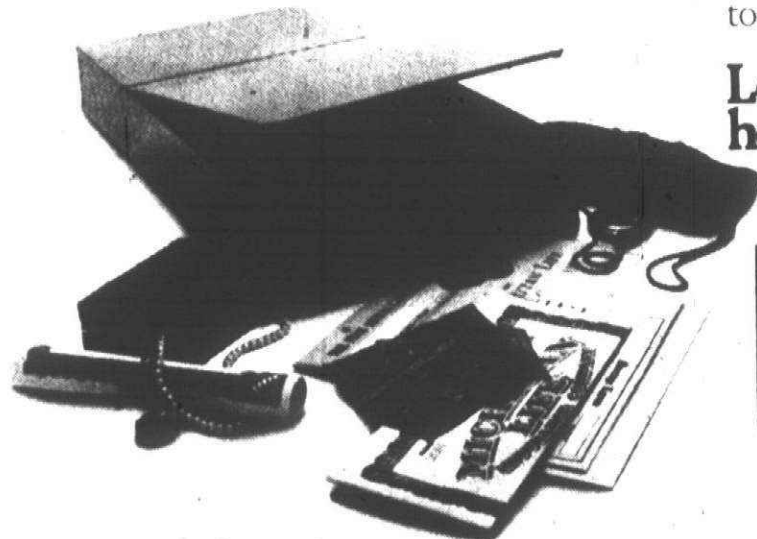

"The baby won't find out if he's a boy or girl until he goes to shul (synagogue)," Shoshi informed Avram.

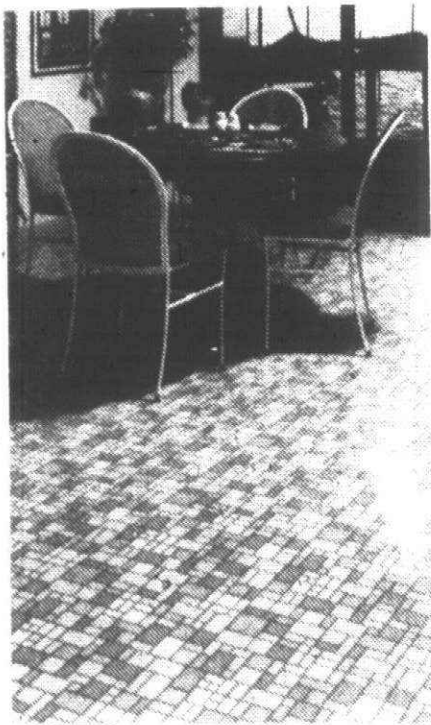
"That's not so," protested Avram. "How's he gonna find out if he's a boy or girl when he goes to shul?"

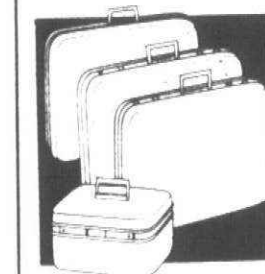

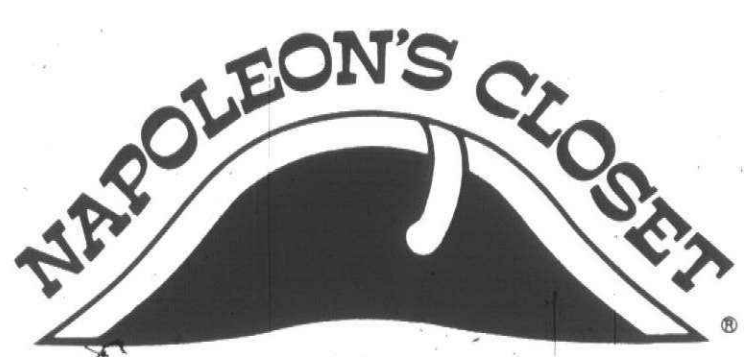

Baron's masters stun the mind

Baron Thyssen-Bornemisza, the man who possesses the world's greatest private collection of old masters, excepting the Royal Collection of the Queen of England, has sent 57 select works on their first American tour.

The show, which began at the National Gallery of Washington, D.C., is on display at the Detroit Institute of Arts. It will make a two-year, nine-city circuit, ending at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.

A partial listing of the artists represented reads like an index for the history of art — Titian, Rubens, Rembrandt, Duccio, Goya, Watteau, El Greco, Fragonard, Eyck, Steen, and Tintoretto.

Yet these samples are from a huge accumulation of art treasures including 340 masterworks housed in a museum wing of the Baron Thyssen-Bornemisza's 17th century Tuscan villa on Lake Lugano, Switzerland. Given the fact that these are all possessions of a single man can't but induce a feeling of sheer amazement.

OBJECTS D'ART ARE not the only property of the Baron. His international holdings in business, finance, industry and commerce run into many hundreds of millions of dollars.

Grandfather August Thyssen, who began the empire with iron and steel works, came to be known as the German Andrew Carnegie. His son, Hans Heinrich, assumed the title first when he married the lovely, but poor daughter of a Hungarian aristocrat and an American beauty.

Forced to flee his newly adopted homeland during the Hungarian revolution, the man of property settled in Holland where he began acquiring art. His son, the present Baron, was born there in 1921, a place which continues to hold such affection for him that he refuses to bid against Dutch museums at public auction.

In 1933, the family was moved to Villa Favorita,

The Thyssen masterpieces continue through May 11 at the Detroit Institute of Arts. Admission is \$2.50 (\$1.50 for students and senior citizens).

Public tours are given at 1 p.m. daily. They are free, beyond the fee to the exhibit.

Taped tours with the voices of museum director Frederick Cummings, Baron Thyssen-Bornemisza and museum European art curator Dewey Mosby can be rented at the exhibit admission desk.

The institute is open 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday.

Castagnola, Switzerland. At his death in 1947, the items in the collection were divided among his four children, but the second Baron decided that, as a memorial to his father, he would repurchase as many of the originals as possible.

THE REUNITED WORKS now account for two-thirds of the total art collection. Soon he was adding to it himself — filling gaps, starting new periods including Impressionist and modern paintings (not represented here) as well as most of the Italian, French and Spanish works in the show. The Baron has also been very active in the preservation of art and is known for his generous donations to Florence after the terrible flood.

Paintings are displayed in four rooms chronologically from early 14th to early 19th Century, and include German, Flemish, Italian, Dutch, Spanish and French master painters. The earliest is a rare 1310 Duccio and the last, an 1820 Goya.

Spanning them is an enchanted stroll through a tiny, rich museum all on its own. Some of the works are so wonderfully sumptuous that one returns to them again and again, tearing away only with the greatest reluctance. Two outstanding aids to view-

"The older people don't understand it, but these guys are educated men. They're not a bunch of flakes off the street. They've gone to school and studied music, and they ended up with rock. Well, that's where the bread and butter is. They're in it to make money. That's the name of the game."

"I picked up Kiss in Lansing once. They are the friendliest guys you would ever want to meet."

"Like Gene Simmons. He would never expect this guy to be as lovable and friendly, he's a real peach. You see them in their Kiss attire as wild men but they are really quiet, down-to-earth people."

ROBBINS DRIVES groups to theaters and arenas throughout Michigan.

"We like to drive out to Pine Knob because we get away from all those darn buildings," he says.

"Last season was just great. It ended with Bette Midler. She is really a loving and friendly person. She told me she loved Pine Knob and she is looking forward to returning."

"If I were to pass away today and there was such a thing as reincarnation, I would want to come back and do the exact same thing that I'm doing now. I love it."

Thyssen exhibit: masters on tour

ing the exhibit are the acousti guide and the fully illustrated catalog written by Allen Rosenbaum.

UPON ENTERING THE GALLERY, the eyes are at once arrested by Hans Memling's "Portrait of a Young Man," 1490. It was chosen for the catalog cover. The small, compact picture sums up the corporeal and spiritual attitude of an age of courtly manners. The handsome, meticulously groomed, worshipful young man appears both manly and gentle, intent yet calm, the worldly wise in pious supplication to a divine spirit.

His hands come lightly together in prayer with barely touching fingertips. The beautifully detailed clothing, a manicured garden just beyond a marble column indicated a very stylish, comfortable life of wealth and ease. The open, pensive face, framed by a billowy dark mane of hair, is lighted by a source away from the window, probably a missing panel of the Virgin Mary.

On the reverse of the panel is one of the earliest known still life renderings. It is a vase of flowers having symbolic religious meaning, indicating that

the panel was probably part of an altarpiece or a matrimonial triptych. The white lily is to signify the purity of the Virgin Mary. The purple iris indicated her royalty as Queen of Heaven, the blue columbine represents the Holy Ghost.

BRUGES' GREAT renaissance artist Jan van Eyck painted the marvelous diptych of the Annunciation, 1436, in the experimental grisaille of transparent grey oils. The shallow black marble niches even appear to reflect the backs of the figures, an optical illusion of surprising realism.

"Christ and the Woman of Samaria" was one of the panels in an altarpiece complex of the Cathedral of Sienna, Italy. At the time of its creation, it was the largest of such undertakings, comprising more than 90 pictures from the studio of Duccio Bonisegna.

Because it was the first picture that the present Baron very much admired, it might be credited with launching his own collection. He considers it one of the prizes of the entire collection as well as one of the great works of art history.

The most imposing, majestic and magically intri-

guing work in the exhibit is Vittore Carpaccio's "Young-Knight in a Landscape," from 1510. It is the earliest life sized, full-length portrait painted in Italy. But it is more than an historical innovation, it is laden with a profusion of interesting details and symbols which identify the subject by name and title as Francesco Maria della Rovere, Duke of Urbino.

THE LATIN MOTTO, "DIE painfully rather than be sullied," refers to the order of knighthood to which the young Duke's grandfather was a founding member. The gold and black checkered heraldry on the knight's shoes and scabbard which match the livery of his squire are the Duke of Urbino's colors.

The oak trees refer to the family name, Rovere, which means oak in Italian. His birthday on the Feast of the Annunciation and middle name Maria are indicated by the iris and lily as the flowers of the Virgin Mary, for whom he is named.

Time and motion seem to have been halted in this surrealistic landscape which surrounds the knight with a golden atmosphere of even light undisturbed by natural elements.

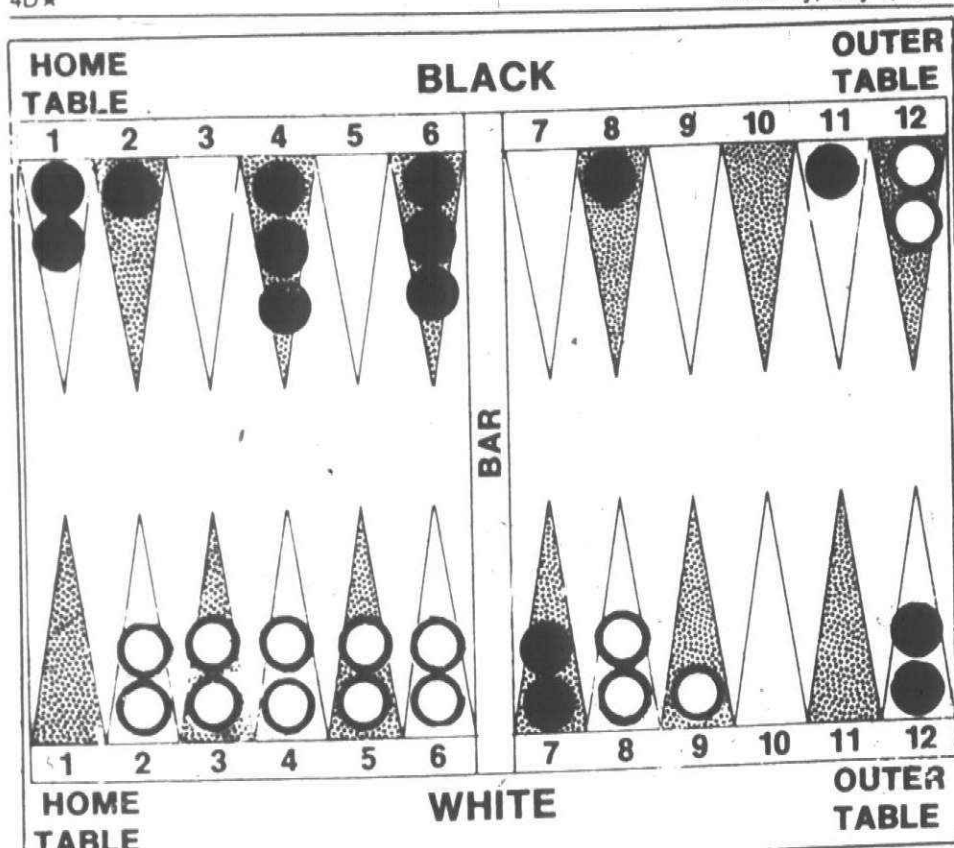

WHO'S HOLDING WHO?

Black rolls double fours. What should he do?

At this stage in the game, black's main choice is to either move the furthest two checkers away from white's 7 point (called the "bar point") to black's 15 point and begin the running game, or stay there to continue a "holding game" and move other checkers.

A holding game consists of purposely holding an opponent's key point in order to thwart his progress in his own

inner table, with the possibility of obtaining a hit later.

Let's look at a few considerations to help make the choice easier.

No matter how black moves, white will be eight "pips" (total number of points outside the home board) ahead in the race. White will also be up to roll and has better inner table distribution for the better-off.

If black runs from the bar point now, he will give white the further advantage of having a clean run home. This will allow white the opportunity to move as quickly as possible instead of

as safely as possible if black stays put.

BEST OVERALL MOVE

Black should stay on white's bar point and move both men from white's 12 point down to black's 5 point. Black now has active builders to cover the 2-point blot and stall for time in the next few rolls white waiting for white to open up.

White now is under pressure to cover his own 9-point blot and may even have to break his inner table instead of leaving another outer table blot.

This holding situation is most often misplaced when the player who is actually ahead in the race doesn't realize it and thinks he should try to hold his opponent and wait for a shot. He is unknowingly thwarting his own running game.

So remember: Before you move, decide who's holding who.

Museum displaying automobile history

A new exhibit of local automotive history is open at the Detroit Historical Museum.

It features a photo history of the UAW and a dozen historically significant cars from the museum's collection and from private collectors.

Included is the Bi-Auto-Go, the world's first two-wheeled car, designed by James Scripps Booth and constructed in 1912 at Cranbrook, then his family estate. It has one of the first American V-8 engines.

Also on display is Henry Leland's personal 1905 Cadillac Coupe (the first enclosed Cadillac), a 1934 Chrysler Airflow, a 1942 Packard and a 1963 Mustang prototype.

The museum, at 5401 Woodward in the Cultural Center, is open 1-9 p.m. Wednesday; 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; and 1-5 p.m. Sunday.

Production up in northwest

One of the fastest growing and most promising wine regions in the United States is the Pacific Northwest. Long known for their fruit and berry wines, the last decade has witnessed a real surge in quality grape production.

Today such names as Aimty, Elk Cove, Eyrie, Hillcrest, Humbug (honest), Knudsen Erath, Ponzi, Reuter's Hill, Siskiyou, Tualatin, Bingen, Hinzerling, Preston and Vierthalen are unknown on Michigan shelves.

It will probably be some time before we do see any of them, but if chance requires you to travel in this most beautiful area there is a great variety to find on local wine merchant shelves.

However, one winery, Chateau Ste. Michelle, bonded quietly back in 1934, has attained national distribution and now has their full line of wines on our shelves. In general they are priced in the middle of the range of West Coast wines, most released in the \$3.50-\$7 range. I have recently sampled the whole group and am most enthusiastic about them.

The vineyards are located between the Yakima and Columbia Rivers in the Yakima Valley, east of the Cascade Mountain Range, and then are taken to the winery in Woodinville, a suburb of Seattle, just northeast of town. The vineyard latitudes correspond almost perfectly to Burgundy, as they are proud to point out in their promotional literature.

To date their releases have been predominately white wines, although at least three reds have shown as well.

Following are some general tasting impressions:

JOHANNISBERG REISLING — estate bottling called "White Reisling," their most prominent and successful release, the wine is beautifully balanced with soft fruit and enough acid to produce character.

SEMILLION BLANC — a lush, soft wine from a varietal greatly out of favor in California now. Excellent introduction to a most elegant grape of subtle spice.

SAUVIGNON BLANC — excels most of the white Bordeaux now coming out at half the price. This is my personal favorite of their white wine releases.

GEWURZTRANINER — light flowery bouquet with a beautiful after-taste. A marvelous accompaniment to a mildly spicy dinner.

CHABLIS — their only generic release, this is a crisp wine with a strong hint of fruit. This is vintage dated. Be sure to get a recent vintage, this you'll want to drink young.

GRENACHE ROSE — very full-bodied and rich in color, the fruit nearly jumps out of the glass. This is as close to a Tavel as the West Coast has come. It may even be a bit too rich for some.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON — the 1973-74-75 vintages are all available and all worthwhile. They tend more to the soft and elegant style and will require little more bottle age.

MERLOT — the 1976 issue is the first we have seen locally. It is now very drinkable although a hearty amount of tannin will hold it some more years.

There is also a sparkling wine, available only at the winery. This I eagerly look forward to trying, whatever its price.

To be a wine critic suggests some negative comments are in order somewhere, and it is somewhat frustrating to acknowledge that, to date at least, none of the Chateau Ste. Michelle wines have disappointed me.

They are dependable and frequently exciting and, perhaps best of all, they do not yet charge those inflated prices that some of their California counterparts do. Let's hope this continues and the quality holds.
