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Past, present supervisors vie for top job

A present and past supervisor will battle it out for Canton's top administrative job in the township primary next August.

A third ex-supervisor, Harold Stein, said he is considering a campaign for some township post — possibly the supervisor's position.

Trustee Robert Greenstein — Canton's supervisor from 1974 to 1976 — took the first step on the campaign trail at a press conference Monday afternoon.

Greenstein said he feels "compelled" to seek the Democratic supervisor's nomination because of the "incompetence" of the other candidates.

Canton's present supervisor — Noel Culbert — reluctantly admitted his reelection bid later in the day.

Culbert submitted his nominating petitions Monday morning. But he planned to withhold public announcement of his candidacy, "because I wanted to figure out what I'd say in a press release."

CULBERT'S PETITIONS were the first submitted by any township candidate, according to Clerk John Flodin. The filing deadline is June 3.

Greenstein, Culbert and Stein have met on the campaign trail before. All three are Democrats.

In the 1976 primary, incumbent Greenstein lost the Democratic supervisor's nomination to Stein. In November, Stein narrowly defeated Greenstein's write-in campaign.

Culbert lost his bid for a trustee spot in 1976.

In the 1978 election, Culbert yanked the Democratic nomination from incumbent Stein. Like his predecessor, Stein tried his hand at an unsuccessful write-in campaign in November.

Greenstein won a two-year trustee slot in the 1978 election.

Greenstein said Monday that "as of four days ago, I wasn't going to be a candidate. I didn't want to be supervisor, because I didn't want to give up my law practice."

But Greenstein, who predicts a depression "a la 1930 or Germany in

1924," believes that competent leadership is needed now more than ever.

Greenstein said he tried unsuccessfully to convince Trustee Stephen Larson to launch a supervisor's campaign. He said he considered a re-election bid for trustee, if Larson decided to run for supervisor.

"It seemed, with the candidates on the horizon, I had no choice (except to run for supervisor)," Greenstein said.

He said Stein's administration was marked by "horrible increases in employees, duplication and mammoth increases in government spending."

"Under Culbert, there is no management at all," Greenstein charges. "The township is kind of rolling on its own."

Greenstein said he expected both men to seek the supervisor's nomination.

BUT NEITHER Stein nor Culbert would accept Greenstein's bait and respond to criticisms of their administrations.

"I feel I have until June 3 to decide what I'm going to do," said Stein.

"I feel it's going to be a long, hard campaign if I do decide to run. I don't want to engage in this kind of activity earlier than I have to."

Taken aback by the timing of Greenstein's announcement, Culbert said he was unprepared to make a statement on the platform of his candidacy.

He maintains that Canton's traditional political issues — such as farmland preservation, controlled growth and a new zoning ordinance — are no longer applicable because of board action in the past two years and a slump in the construction industry.

"My response (to Greenstein's criticism) is that he has to campaign on something," Culbert said. "There's not many issues left."

"Everyone always claims incompetence against the incumbent supervisor."

Culbert maintains that someone in Canton "must raise the level of campaigning."

"I am going to run a campaign that emphasizes me," he said. "I'm not going to criticize anyone or sling mud."

Culbert credits his administration for the relatively "quiet" atmosphere in Canton political circles.

"There hasn't been the polarization over this or that. It's been relatively smooth politically."

GREENSTEIN ADMITS that a divi-

sive political atmosphere permeated his tenure as supervisor. Some citizens

strenuously campaigned for Greenstein's re-election, while others vehemently opposed his actions.

But Greenstein says the political clashes that characterized his administration were a product of the times more than anything else.

"In 1974, we came from a farming community under (former Supervisor) Phil Dingley to a more modern, subdivision-oriented community. When I took office, there were no controls over berms or signs. There was nothing."

"People obviously took sides. There was indeed a divisive fight between the new subdivision dwellers and the old guard."

Greenstein's claim to the supervisor job revolves around his self-avowed leadership abilities.

He is quick to point out that he

Mom-less ducks adopt new home

They were only a week old when their mother was killed by a hit-and-run driver Sunday.

Without mom, the 11 babies would probably have died, too.

But the mallard ducklings, which were waddling behind their mother across a major Farmington Hills thoroughfare, got lucky.

Brian Sanders, 24, of Canton slammed on his brakes when the responsible driver kept going down Grand River near Drake Road. Sanders scooped up mother and her young and placed them in his car.

A short time later, the mother died.

Eleven noisy orphans did not daunt Sanders and his wife, Kathy, in their efforts to find a home for ducklings. They spent the next 2½ hours calling veterinary clinics, Humane Society branches and other animal facilities.

THEIR QUEST came to an end on the Canton farm of Duane Bordine. The farmer was mowing grass near his home at Ford and Ridge roads, when Sanders decided to stop and ask his advice.

To the couple's surprise, Bordine quickly offered a home for the orphans on the 175 acres he tills in western Canton.

Since taking in the ducklings, Bordine has interrupted his work schedule and sleep to feed them oatmeal and water every five hours.

He plans to build a pond near his produce operation for the ducklings' splashing and swimming enjoyment. Kids can watch the ducks, while their parents pick strawberries and beans.

The area must be fenced to prevent attacks from cats and raccoons, Bordine said.

"I don't know why I'm going to do it. I have so damn much to do," said the farmer, who used to raise ducks and geese.

"But I enjoy doing it. I'm human enough to take in ducklings with no mother."

The ducklings are not the first creatures adopted by Bordine.

Last year, it was a baby racoon cornered by a rooster.

"This spring, he just meandered off," said Bordine. "When the ducklings get big enough and they want to fly, I won't detain them. They'd probably come back anyway."

WITHOUT BORDINE'S offer, Sanders said he would have kept the ducklings in his Fellow Creek apartment until Wednesday, when they could be admitted to Kensington Metro Park facilities.

Firm leases cable channel to air local shows

When OMNICON Inc. of Michigan first began courting exclusive cable television rights in the Plymouth-Canton community, few residents were able to fathom the potential of such a service.

Most people viewed cable television as something that improved reception and offered box office movies at home.

It's now been several months since those rights were obtained from Canton, Plymouth Township and the city of Plymouth and the groundwork is under way for installing cables.

A relatively new business in Plymouth, Video Services Inc., has leased one of the firm's channels to provide local news and feature programming.

Company owner Denny Campbell, a long-time Plymouth resident, already has made plans for a line-up of programs that includes two news spots daily, a gourmet cooking show, and a program tentatively called "For Car Buffs Only."

In addition to that, there would be four hours of advertising.

Twice daily, viewers will see a continuing run of classified ads, real estate advertising and another full hour of auto and truck sales.

THE LEASE on Channel 6 runs for five years.

While Campbell may admit he's a newcomer to the world of television production, he's not a newcomer to Plymouth. And that local angle is an

important factor in his long-range plans.

"It became a very appealing thing to me to fulfill a void in this community," says the '58 Plymouth High graduate about additional news broadcasts and advertising.

And about advertising opportunities for merchants here, he adds:

"What do local merchants have in advertising? While there is no radio, there should be a choice for something else. I've lived here all my life and I'm fully aware of the impact of shopping centers to Plymouth. Business turnover has been very high and yet there's a lot of new people transferring in and out."

"The pitch will be — 'If you live here, shop here.' It's an effective way to keep people interested in the community."

Video Services is a business that Campbell started after he was sidetracked after 15 years of work in the auto industry.

"It's the non-Hollywood part of video," he explains. Most of their work is in video taping of inventory for business and private uses.

He became interested in this type of work after his brother received a home video recorder as a Christmas present. Once Campbell understood how it worked — he was hooked.

PRESENTLY, Video Services is a two-man operation including Campbell and veteran newspaperman Fred DeLano of Plymouth Township. Campbell is counting on DeLano's expertise to carry the newswriting end of the pro-

pose channel offerings.

Campbell contends the Plymouth-Canton community is a market that's ripe for local news programming nightly. He anticipates a 15-minute time slot at 6:45 p.m. (following national cable news) and then a follow-up slot near 10 p.m.

Both men hope the introduction of a nightly newscast would elicit a spirit of "cooperation" with the two local newspapers in town over the possibility of the newspapers acting as "feeders" for the television newscasts.

"The overall result will be an improvement in the total news coverage," says DeLano. "Yes, Channel 16 will have the time break very often. But in all cases it might push both papers (referring to the Plymouth and Canton Observers as well as the Community Crier) into more in-depth coverage of the news than they now do."

"It will be more beneficial to the community."

Campbell says it's expected the local programming channel will be "on the air" once OMNICON's cables are set in the fall. At that time, only Plymouth and Plymouth Township will be serviced with Canton Township's service following later.

AS YET, he's undecided about plans for local news coverage in both Northville which also anticipate cable service.

As for who would work as the news-

casts' anchorperson-reporter, Campbell says he's contacted former Plymouth resident Mark Strautz about the job. Strautz now works for another cable firm in Texas in that capacity. No agreement has been reached as yet.

While waiting for service to begin, Campbell has taped a pilot show starring locally renowned Larry Janes, former owner of the Gourmet Gallery in Plymouth.

Janes is an accomplished chef who will soon make another guest appearance on the Kelly and Co. morning show. He is also remembered as last year's emcee for the Plymouth Chicken Flying Contest.

"We have a good shot at sponsorship for his show and possible syndication (nationwide)," Campbell adds. "We've had a couple of big league producers look at the pilot and their only criticism was that we stifled his humor."

"For Car Buffs Only" is another try at speciality programming.

"I happen to be a car buff and there's been no programming on the air for me (on that topic)."

So far, the two specialty shows, nightly news casts, and four-hours of advertising, comprise his established line-up to run from about 10 a.m. to 11 p.m. He says he may pick up movies to run in the afternoons.

However, he does have some other ideas kicking in his Main Street office.

Among them a program modeled after P.M. Magazine. He hopes to recruit Centennial Educational Park students who work at the park's WSDP radio station for help in this broadcast.

"MY FUTURE plans are to run amateur theater group performances. I'm also very interested in running little league and junior hockey league sports."

He also plans to coordinate programming that spotlights activities for senior citizens as well as a possible morn-

ing exercise program for senior citizens.

"I'm not afraid of the specialty market — car buffs, fisherman, crafts. But no sitcoms. I'm tired of that."

"So far, all we've done is scratch the surface. I'd just rather be doing than waiting right now."

"I plan on working behind the cameras, directing, holding cue cards as well as general manager. I've worn the regimental tie for 15 years — this is going to be fun."

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Manning proposes \$2 Hines park fee

A "friendly" proposal by Wayne County Commissioner Richard E. Manning, D-Redford, to the county parks trustees may lead to \$2 park fees. Manning calls it one method of keeping rest rooms, ball diamonds and other facilities open to the public.

The public works committee, chaired by Commissioner Clarence R. Young, D-Ecorse, recommended Manning's proposal. It also recommended the park trustees return with a full report on the amount of funding they will require to keep facilities — particularly rest rooms — open this summer in all county parks.

The problem has become increasingly worse at the Edward Hines Parkway

in the western suburbs, where attendance has leaped to nearly 40,000 during hot days, causing a number of confrontations between park users and residents in the area.

MANNING SAID signs could be posted throughout the park warning motorists that a \$2 parking fee "sticker" is required.

Courtesy tickets would then be issued by police. Motorists in violation would be given three days to purchase the parking sticker.

"Parking fees," he said, "would not be required of bicyclists or pedestrians and no one would be refused right-of-way through the park. Only those wish-

ing to park their vehicles — and that includes motorcyclists — will be required to display the \$2 'park sticker'."

"We are doing nothing more than is required at state and federal parks, and it provides us with necessary funds to maintain the park facilities," he added.

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Choices are myriad in tax proposal war

Nearly 20 major tax cut proposals have been initiated in Michigan to date — enough to tax anyone's imagination. Initiative proposals of Rep. Roy Smith, R-Ypsilanti and Rep. Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor, Rep. Mark Siljander, R-Three Rivers, and Shiawassee County Drain Commissioner Bob Tisch merit a closer look as does the Republican Task Force Proposal spearheaded by Rep. Donald Van Singel, R-Grant, and Sen. Harry Gast, R-St. Joseph. Five other proposals are highlighted here to help voters sort through the offerings.

Governor William Milliken's tentative proposal would:

- Provide homeowners a \$500 property tax exemption.
- Remove 1 percent sales tax per year from household utility purchases.
- Increase the tax equivalent of renters from 17 percent to 22 percent of rent, and provide a \$50 minimum to all renters.
- Reimburse local units of government for revenue lost.
- Increase the sales tax from 4 percent to 5.5 percent.

Senator Gary Corbin, D-Clio and Rep. Bobby Crim, D-Davison, head up an assortment of senate bills:

- SB838 exempts first \$3,000 of state equalized valuation (SEV) of homesteads from property taxes; the state reimburses local units for revenue loss.
- SB839 revises homestead property tax credit so that \$3,000 exemption is not included in property tax credit computation. Increases sales tax credit for low income persons.
- Provides for an equivalent income tax credit for renters.

- SB840 increases sales tax by one percent.
- SB841 increases use tax by 1 percent.

Senator Stephen Monsma, D-Grand Rapids, is sponsor of SB1110 which would:

- Return to homeowner taxes in excess of 3.5 percent of household (personal) income.
- Increase income tax from 4.6 percent to 5.1 percent.
- Increase personal exemption from \$1,500 to \$1,800.

- All property tax returned to those with less than \$4,000 personal income.
- Greater relief for those from \$4,000 to \$10,000 income.

An initiative petition sponsored by Rep. Ed Fredricks, R-Holland would:

- Repeal the Single Business Tax on Dec. 31, 1980.
- Decrease the personal income tax rate from 4.6 to 4.4 percent on Jan. 1, 1981, 4.2 percent on Jan. 1, 1981, and 4 percent on Jan. 1, 1986.
- Exempt pension income from the personal income tax.
- Increase the personal exemption

- from \$1,500 to \$1,800 and indexes the exemptions to the Detroit consumer price index.
- Institute a 10 percent corporation and financial institution income tax with a \$50,000 indexed exemption.
- Prohibit the levying of taxes other than the 10 percent income tax on business income.

Rep. George Montgomery, D-Detroit, is sponsor of HB4075 which would:

- Double and graduate the property tax credit system.
- Increase the income tax from 4.6 percent to 5.4 percent.

Siljander eyes sales tax hike

He speaks with the fervor of a revivalist preacher more than the polish of a state legislator. He's young, 28, and looks at himself as an outsider from the Lansing political establishment.

For three years the chairman of the Christians in Government State Leadership Committee has been battling to get his property tax relief proposal approved by his colleagues.

Each year he has been thwarted. That's why State Rep. Mark Siljander, R-Three Rivers, has taken his crusade to the streets.

The Siljander initiative petition drive is just one of at least four seeking the necessary 280,000 signatures to make the November ballot.

But time and name recognition both are working against Siljander's goal.

He has only until July 9 to collect the needed signatures. And he's fighting against some well-known statewide figures who tout their own tax reform drives — Robert Tisch and State Rep. Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor, are two examples.

Siljander, by contrast, comes from a western Michigan city of 7,355 and is an unknown quantity in the heavily populated Detroit metropolitan area where most signatures are obtained for such petition drives.

"I think the people of this state are mad so one of these tax proposals are going to pass," he tells those who gather to listen.

"Somethings got to be done, but we've got to work together. I'm not out to get you," he says to those who question the intent of "just another" state legislator.

THE SILJANDER amendment, if adopted, would eliminate property tax on the first 26 mills assessed by the state's school districts, resulting in a net tax savings of more than a third of a billion dollars.

Some \$450 million in lost revenues would be made up through a 1 percent increase in the state's sales and use tax, according to Siljander.

"It's a tax cut, not a shift," he says, noting that other proposals would shift taxes over to the income tax.

The proposal put forth by Bullard and state Rep. Roy Smith, R-Ypsilanti, is a tax shift.

If approved the Siljander amendment would:

- Exempt all property tax on homes valued up to \$50,000 for senior citizens, blind and disabled persons. This exemption would increase with the rate of inflation.

- Increase tax breaks for renters. Presently, a renter can receive an income tax credit against a certain ratio of the rent paid, that the state considers as property tax.

Under Siljander, renters would have an increase of renters' credits by increasing the 17 percent ratio figure to 20 percent as a minimum. The legislature could increase it if they wished.

- Limit state income tax burden by mandating that personal exemptions rise with the rate of inflation.

If a residential property went up 50 percent and the inflation rate were 20 percent, the 30 percent difference between the inflation rate and the assessment increases would have to be reflected in a rollback of mills.

- Guarantee lottery revenues for education.

- Limit the number of school millage elections to two a year. If the first two elections fail, the amendment would allow the residents of a district to petition and request the school board to place a third, fourth or fifth election before voters.

- Result in a cut in state spending. The effect, says Siljander, would be a net loss to the state budget of at least \$300 million in 1979 dollars.

Savings would come from balancing Michigan social service payment payments to what Indiana, Ohio, Wisconsin and Illinois are paying in ADC, ADCU and general assistance and because the amendment wouldn't be adopted until 1981-82 the estimated 8 percent increase would be absorbed. In short, the state would be forced to live with a smaller increase.

- Provide direct state reimbursement to local units of government.

- Require a two-thirds vote of the legislature to increase taxes or create a new tax. Siljander points out that two thirds of the legislature historically hasn't agreed on anything of significance and therefore, he maintains, that guarantees the state legislature wouldn't be raising taxes.

Tisch proposes budget slash

Robert Tisch plans to cut \$2 billion out of the state budget and at least a dozen other tax cut/tax shift proposals including Governor William Milliken are trying to sell voters a less drastic plan.

If the Tisch plan is approved, it would cut by half property taxes based on 1978 state equalized valuation, by 75 percent taxes of those earning between \$5,000 and \$10,500, and exempt from property tax households earning less than \$5,000.

The state would be required to reimburse local government for every tax dollar lost including school district revenue (the amendment would exempt

anyone over 62 from paying school operating millage.)

Any new state taxes would be subjected to support of 60 percent of Michigan voters.

Tisch doesn't offer a plan to compensate for the \$2 billion chunk out of the almost \$9 billion state budget. Legislators have called his proposal irresponsible and say passage would be devastating.

Yet support is rolling along. He needs 280,000 signatures on petitions by July 9 to get the proposal on the November ballot. Depending on taxpayer mood a half-year from now, his plan could be implemented.

GOP seeking Lansing action

The Siljander proposal offering tax relief to beleaguered property owners across Michigan is just about being duplicated by a Republican Task Force committee proposal in Lansing.

The difference between the two is that Siljander is going the petition route to get his proposal before voters in November while Task Force backers are trying to do it in the state Legislature.

The main elements of the Task Force proposal are to reduce taxes by exempting the first 26 mills levied by lo-

cal government for operation of schools; exempt \$25,000 of state equalized valuation (SEV) for senior citizens and the disabled; increase renters rebates through special tax forms from 17 to 20 percent; raise the sales tax 1.5 percent and cut state spending by \$250 million.

"It's innovative, creative, reasonably simplistic and would cut the duplicity of county and local services," said Senator Harry Gast, R-St. Joseph.

Some 24 field offices of the Department of Treasury now help senior citizens obtain tax breaks. The Task Force proposal would standardize the procedure for property owners over 65.

Bullard-Smith want shift to income tax

State Reps. Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor, and Roy Smith, R-Saline, have launched a bi-partisan effort in an attempt to cut off public support for the Tisch tax cut petition drive.

If the Tisch amendment is adopted, \$2 billion will be cut from state coffers. Many critics believe such a cut would be disastrous to the state.

Local officials also fear their budgets would be cut drastically if the proposed amendment support by Shiawassee drain commissioner Robert Tisch were approved by voters.

Bullard and Smith, whose district includes part of Plymouth, have launched their own petition drive and are seeking the necessary 280,000 to get on the November ballot.

"Those who support or vote for the Tisch amendment shouldn't complain when vital state services are drastically reduced or completely eliminated," says Bullard.

"Nor should Tisch supporters complain when local services such as police and fire protection, trash pickup and water quality are cut 20 percent," he said.

Bullard estimates that the state would only have \$1.7 billion to work with under Tisch — less than half of current funding.

"ANYONE WHO BELIEVES that these essential services can be provided at less than half their current cost is being misled or misinformed."

"No matter how hard we try, we can't get something for nothing, not even from the state of Michigan," he says.

As an alternative, the Smith-Bullard Plan would eliminate property taxes for the support of K-12 education. In addition, senior citizens would be exempted from all property taxes on the first \$25,000 of homestead value.

The money would be made up by an increase in the state income tax of less than 2 percent and a statewide tax on all property other than homesteads and resident farm property of up to 30.5 mills.

Residents of every school district would have the option of voting to supplement state funding with a local tax of either seven mills or a one percent income tax, separately or in combination, for local educational programs.

"For working people, this amendment represents a more equitable funding of K-12 education by

shifting from an often unfairly inflated property tax on homes to a much more progressive income tax while sharing revenue for school funding from the statewide tax on all property other than homes and farms," says Smith.

Remaining the same would be property taxes for other local governmental units including county, township and city government, community colleges, vocational education, special education and intermediate school districts.

Another selling point of Smith-Bullard is that it would provide for a rollback, by class of property, of taxes which increase faster than the rate of inflation.

"Many voters thought this had been done by the so-called tax limitation amendment," says Bullard, referring to the 1978 Headlee tax amendment.

"It didn't limit the rate of growth of each class of property. Since industrial and commercial property values are increasing below the rate of inflation, the values of residential property can increase — and are increasing — under the Headlee amendment faster than inflation," says Bullard.

Under the plan, homeowners property tax would be reduced by establishing a maximum statewide levy of 24.5 mills. Monies for education would be provided by levying a property tax on industrial and commercial property not to exceed 30.5 mills.

Sanders' 3-year-old daughter, Aimee, may be the only one upset over the Bordine living arrangement.


"The ducks kept chirping and chirping in the back seat," said Sanders. "She kept telling them not to fight."

A clinic for 7-10-year-olds from 9-11 a.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday will begin June 23 at Bird Elementary School.


A clinic for 10-13-year-olds will meet from 3-5 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday beginning June 23 at West Middle School.

The day in Plymouth started at 9 a.m. with Mayor Bates being presented with keys to the city of Plymouth and then taken on a tour of city hall.



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
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
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County charter census battle heads to court

A lawyer for suburban Wayne County governments said this week his clients will go to court to block election of a county charter commission based on the 1970 census.

"We're going to go to the courts... there's no question about it," said John F. Dodge Jr. He is attorney for the Wayne County Communities for Equal Representation, a coalition of 39 suburban cities and townships.

However, whether the suit will be in the state circuit court or federal district court has not been decided, Dodge added.

THE SUBURBAN group wants districts for a proposed county charter commission to be apportioned on the 1980 census, which is expected to show that the out-county has the same population as the city of Detroit.

Use of the '70 census, the group argues, would give Detroit more seats on the charter commission than it's entitled to.

Even though the fate of a charter commission won't be decided by county voters until the Aug. 5 primary election, state law governing the reorganization process requires charter districts to be drawn now.

Candidates for charter commissioners will be nominated at the Aug. 5 primary.

DODGE MADE his comments this week following a decision by the county apportionment commission that charter districts be the same as the existing 27 county commissioner districts.

Those districts, based on the 1970 census, give Detroit a 16-11 voting edge on the county board which it would have on the charter commission. The majority bloc consists of 13 Detroit commissioners and three from the central and inner suburbs of Highland Park-Hamtramck, Ecorse-River Rouge and Harper Woods.

The apportionment commission's decision to accept a 1972 apportionment of the county for charter districts was based on an opinion issued last week by Michigan Attorney General Frank J. Kelley.

"He (Kelley) has said the '72 apportionment will be used, period," County Clerk James R. Killeen said at Monday's apportionment commission meeting. "I don't see where it gives us any options." Killeen is also apportionment commission chairman.

State law "prohibits the county apportionment commission from adopting a new plan (other than the 1972 apportionment) until the latest United States official census figures are available," Kelley wrote in his opinion, requested by State Rep. William A. Ryan, D-Detroit.

IN RESPONSE to a question posed by State Rep. Thomas Brown, D-Westland, Kelley said 1980 census figures could be used only if 1) voters reject creation of a charter commission Aug. 5, and 2) the county board puts the reorganization question on the ballot again next year.

New county commissioner districts based on the 1980 census will likely be drawn in time for the 1982 election.

Dodge said Tuesday that Kelley's decision was "totally expected because it was part of the deal in the first place."

Suburban officials have accused Detroit Mayor Coleman Young of making a deal with Gov. William Milliken and the legislature's Democratic leadership to base the charter commission on the 1970 census.

In return for use of the '70 census, they believe Detroit legislators agreed not to block the county reorganization bill which passed the legislature in February.

Gov. Milliken has long demanded the kind of county reorganization possible only in a home rule charter. Milliken

has withheld millions of dollars in state aid to the county.

DODGE DISAGREED that the county apportionment commission had no choice but to base charter districts on the 1970 census.

The commission's "entire process was used to find some law they can hide behind," he said.

PATRICK MCCAULEY, Dodge's law partner, told the apportionment commission that Kelley's opinion was "advisory." He said the state law allowed the apportionment group to establish districts "as equal in population as practicable."

He called the apportionment commission's decision to accept Kelley's interpretation "a silent gerrymander."

"For this commission to find technical ways to abdicate its responsibility to the voters of Wayne County would be a serious miscarriage," McCauley said.

Kelley said in his opinion that the county apportionment commission "discharged its duty" on April 14, 1972,

when it drew proposed charter districts to coincide with the existing county commissioner districts.

Charter commissioners were never seated, because creation of the commission was defeated by voters.

Nonetheless, Kelley said that apportionment is "final" until the '80 census figures become available in 1981. A University of Michigan population

studies professor, hired by Dodge, says that the census figures will likely be available in October.

COUNTY TREASURER Raymond Wojtowicz was the only apportionment commissioner to speak against using the '70 census. The other commissioners, besides Killeen, are County Prosecutor William Cahalan, Marie

Weigold, representing the county Democratic Party, and Edward L. Haroutunian, representing the county Republican Party.

Wojtowicz said: "Any person can go to sections of this county and see vacant lots, and boarded up buildings that are apparently going to be used for voting purposes. I don't think that's right."

Time to file for charter commission

Deadline for Wayne County charter commissioner candidates to file nominating petitions for the Aug. 5 primary is 4 p.m. Tuesday, June 3.

Candidates who prefer to qualify for the ballot by paying a non-refundable \$100 must do so by 4 p.m. Friday, May 30.

Nomination of Democratic and Republican charter commissioners will be on the same ballot as creation of the charter commission itself.

SHOULD THE charter commission be approved by voters, the Democratic and Republican nominees in each district will square off at the Nov. 4 general election for the charter seat.

If voters reject a charter commission, the commissioner nominations will be invalid.

The charter group will propose county government reforms, including whether Wayne should be headed by a manager appointed by the county

board of commissioners or by an elected county executive. All charter commission proposals will be subject to voter approval.

Charter commission candidates must be registered voters in their respective county commissioner districts for at least six months.

Farmer's picture of future for local agriculture bleak

Ordinarily you wouldn't consider Wilford Bunyea, the jovial agriculturist on Powell Road in Plymouth Township, to be a member of the doom and gloom club. That is until you ask him about the future of farming in western Wayne County.

"If prices continue to rise and the developers continue to take up huge sections, farming in western Wayne County is just about doomed. And that would just be too bad."

It is not only the prices and inability to get help which has him speaking of a doomed future for the farmer. One of the biggest threats is the plan to lay a sewer up Haggerty Road.

"When that sewer is completed, you can imagine what will happen. The developers will come in and that will be the end of the farmer."

He didn't say so, but Bunyea was thinking of what happened on the eastern end of Plymouth Township. This was considered to be some of the best farmland in the entire southeastern section of the state. But when the sewers were placed in the area, it didn't take long for the Lake Pointe subdivision to spread into being.

Bunyea has spent most of his life tilling the soil, first at the old farm at Haggerty and Joy roads and, for the past 10 years, on Powell Road.

As he spoke of the troubles facing the

farmer today, Bunyea called attention to the rising prices and stated that from Jan. 1 to Feb. 1 of this year the cost of fertilizer jumped \$40 a ton. And fuel needed to run the tractors went up to \$1 a gallon.

"With those prices, a farmer can't make a success of it anymore. Why, just a short time ago the folks on the DiPonio farm down the road decided to forget the fertilizer this year. And Oakley Hamlin, one of the top corn raisers, decided to cut down even in gardens."

While speaking of the other farmers in the area, Bunyea pointed out the case of his son, Guy, who took over 80

acres to farm — in 1944 — and now the Edison Company has taken all but 10 acres.

The area in the western end of the county was a great producer of corn, soy beans, wheat and garden vegetables. In fact, part of the Wayne County area and some sections south of it were supposed to have produced more corn to the acre than was raised in Iowa.

"And don't forget," Bunyea continued, "that highway I-275 took a lot of farmland too. In fact it went right through our old farm on Haggerty Road. So there is not much farmland left."

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


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
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
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Status quo to cost S'craft \$1 million

If Schoolcraft College is to continue the same programs and services during the next year, it will cost an additional \$917,000.

That's the message the Board of Trustees heard last week from administration officials, who presented a 1980-81 "continuation" budget.

The \$13,990,580 total budget, including debt retirement, is 7.25 percent larger than the current \$13,038,785 spending plan. The college's budget year is from July 1 to June 30.

GENERAL OPERATIONS account for about 93 percent of the budget. The administration proposes to spend \$12,980,722 to operate the college after July 1, a \$917,000 increase over the current operating budget. Instruction accounts for \$7.2 million of the operating budget.

No new programs will be added during the next year, said President C. Nelson Grote.

The college will, however, add a con-

troller, a dean of instruction and one secretary to its staff. Full-time faculty will remain at 164.

The bulk of Schoolcraft's funding comes from the state (40 percent), property tax revenues (33 percent) and tuition (23 percent).

BASED ON a tuition increase in the fall to \$18.50 per credit hour (for in-district students) and a projected 2.5 percent increase in enrollment, Schoolcraft expects a little over \$3 million in revenue from tuition and fees, a 12 percent increase over the current budget.

Current resident tuition is \$17 per credit hour. Out-of-district students who now pay \$27.50 per credit hour will pay \$29 in the fall.

A 7.5 percent increase in state aid to \$5,472,000 is "iffy," according to manager of business services E.F. Petersen. A state-wide budget cut, expected this summer, and no increase in this year's state aid allocations could cut Schoolcraft's piece of the state aid pie by \$230,000, Petersen said.

For the first time in its 15-year histo-

ry, the college may have to roll back its 1.77 mills (\$1.77 per \$1,000 in assessed valuation) tax rate for operations.

The amount of the rollback, if any, has not been determined because the total assessed value in the college district hasn't been certified by Wayne County.

"Our new growth (new construction in the college district) will more than compensate (for the rollback)," said W. Kenneth Lindner, vice president for finance.

UNDER THE Headlee tax limitation amendment, added to the Michigan Constitution by voters in 1978, a taxing unit must roll back its tax rate (millage) if the total base (assessed value) rises faster than the consumer price index, the rate of inflation.

Schoolcraft administrators expect the college district's tax base to increase by 8 percent for 1980-81 to \$2.5 billion. The district includes the Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Plymouth-Canton and Northville school districts.

This year's \$2.3 billion in district SEV (state equalized valuation) repre-

sented a nearly 13 percent increase.

The college expects \$5.1 million in property tax revenues for the new budget, a nearly 7.5 percent increase. Besides the 1.77 mills, Schoolcraft has levied 0.29 mills for debt retirement for a total 2.06 mills tax rate.

College officials propose a slight reduction in the debt retirement millage to 0.28 mills, regardless of any rollback in the operating millage.

BEFORE THE tentative June 11 public hearing on the new budget, the college board will decide on general fund support for cultural and public affairs, additional support for cable television and adjustments to part-time instruction.

Schoolcraft will spend \$5,400 on cable TV equipment in the new budget, an amount Grote said has to be increased in the 1981-82 budget.

Schoolcraft administrators have set aside \$716,394 in the budget contingency fund, the bulk of which is for faculty salary increases.


The Faculty Forum's (Schoolcraft instructors' union) contract with the college expires in August.


McNamara wins SEMTA term

Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara has been re-appointed to a three-year term on the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) Board of Directors.

Out-county representatives on the Wayne County Board of Commissioners approved McNamara's re-appointment unanimously last week after two Detroit commissioners failed in an attempt to stall the vote.

McNamara's new term, which runs through June 1983, is his second. He succeeded Plymouth Commissioner Beverly McAninch in 1978 and was elected SEMTA board chairman almost immediately.

Highland Park Mayor Robert Blackwell was also nominated for the SEMTA board, but Commissioner Martha Scott, D-Highland Park, withdrew Blackwell's name before the vote.

ROTC Cadet Paul Fogarty, son of Mr. and Mrs. Geoffrey Fogarty of Caprice Drive, Plymouth, has earned a Daughters of Founders & Patriots of America Award, drill team and color guard awards, and an award from the Association of the U.S. Army at recent ROTC ceremonies at Northern Michigan University, Marquette. Fogarty, a history major, is a sophomore at Northern.

STATE LAW prohibits the 13 Detroit commissioners on the county board from voting for three SEMTA representatives for outer Wayne County. Eligible to vote were the 11 out-county commissioners plus three whose districts are partially in Detroit.

Mayor Coleman Young appoints five members of the 15-member regional transportation authority board. Outer Wayne has three members, appointed by various means, and Macomb County two. The governor appoints two persons to represent four small counties in the region.

Commissioner Norbert Wisniewski, D-Harper Woods/Detroit, sought to postpone the SEMTA board vote until the state attorney general's office ruled whether the procedure prohibiting Detroit commissioners from voting was legal. He was supported by Commissioner George F. Killeen, D-Detroit, but the attempt failed, 21-2.

"I'm ignored (on the Detroit appointments made by Young), and many of the other commissioners from Detroit are ignored," said Killeen.

He charged that the county board's voting procedure was "unconstitutional" because it denied Detroit commissioners an equal vote under the "one-man, one vote" apportionment principle.

"You don't really believe in it (one-man, one-vote)," said Commissioner Ervin A. Steiner Jr., R-Grosse Pointe, referring to Detroit-suburban differences over county apportionment of proposed charter districts.

"It's based on whose ox is being gored at which time."

McNAMARA, who has been SEMTA board chairman for two years, has been credited with settling differences between Detroit and some suburban board representatives.

Before April 1979, the Detroit-suburban dispute had prevented the SEMTA board from agreeing to any regional rapid transportation plan.

McNamara supported adoption of SEMTA's 1980 plan, which includes a light rail rapid transit line up Woodward Ave.

JERRY ROBERTS

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Issues, not insults, matter in next campaign

It looks as if the supervisor's race for the next term is going to feature at least three contenders — all former holders of the office.

Two of the candidates, incumbent Noel Culbert and trustee Robert Greenstein, have already made their bids official.

Harold Stein, supervisor just prior to Culbert, has not said definitely whether he will run but appears to be leaning in that direction.

All three gentlemen have indicated that they want nothing to do with dirty politics during this election.

If such intentions are observed, we should have a most unusual election — for Canton, anyway.

Dirty politics are a tradition in the township. As election time approaches, allegations, insults and

character defamation fly through the air.

Candidates (not just for supervisor) dig up embarrassing information about each other, circulate vicious campaign literature and generally make a circus out of the election.

If this proposed restraint by supervisor candidates actually takes place, a most strange and wonderful thing may happen:

Those who choose to run for office will have to concentrate on issues, not on attacks of opponents' personalities.

THE ISSUES promise to be a little different this time around than they have been in previous years.

Canton, once growing more quickly than was manageable, is experiencing a hiatus in expansion.

Homes aren't being purchased because of high interest rates and an uncertain economy, which means builders are not constructing new houses to handle the onslaught.

The many problems homeowners have experienced with their new houses have almost been cleared up. There is no new crop of such problems because there is no major influx of people into new houses at the moment.

Homeowner complaints, however, were a big issue when the present Board of Trustees was elected. It's one that will be far less pressing this time around.

INDUSTRIAL development, not seen as a major issue during the last election, should probably be one of the main issues in 1980. People are beginning

to realize that a community with a tax base dependent on residents rather than industry creates a heavy burden on homeowners.

The emphasis on farmland preservation can almost be put in a holding pattern. It is unlikely there will be much development in Canton until the economy improves, placing local farmland in little jeopardy of being eaten up by developers for the time being.

It is not, however, a goal that should be forgotten. The issues now should center on pulling Canton into the form of a community rather than a hodgepodge of homes with little connection.

If all the candidates concentrate on these problems and issues, rather than on what everyone else is doing, the November election will produce a committed and qualified group of elected officials.



Tax labyrinth mystifies public

Upon examining the fuss over Michigan property tax reform, a taxpayer easily could agree with 18th century English economist David Ricardo.

"Taxation under every form presents a choice of evils," he told us in his "Principals of Political Economy and Taxation."

And tax reform in this state is, indeed, a political shell game. Officially, there are more than 20 proposals floating around for consideration. But realistically, only four or five have enough political backing to get off the ground.

This messianic plethora of tax relief proposals has left the electorate profoundly confused.

In 1978, we had to suffer through the protestations of insurance executive Richard Headlee, whose proposal was supported narrowly by Michigan's electorate.


But Headlee's amendment fell far short of its billing. Disgruntled taxpayers found themselves back at square one.

Now they are reluctant to support any of the proposals.

Taxpayer mentality has gotten down to "whom do you trust?" Many are answering "none of the bums."

But that is irresponsible.

On the other hand, some voters are signing just about any petition thrust in their faces which promises tax reform for the middle class.



CLEAR THINKING taxpayers should resist such temptation. Truthfully, tax relief for the middle class is highly unlikely. After all, it is the middle class which has the bucks to pay the bills in this country.

Equity, not relief, should be the goal sought by concerned taxpayers.

But the mood of the electorate dictates a vengeance against any and all government taxation. And that's bad for everyone.

Governments exist to serve residents — especially local governments.

The taxation plan with the potential for harming government services the most is being proposed by

tax-slash militant Robert Tisch.

The Shiawassee County drain commissioner dreams of draining state and local governmental coffers to the point of dehydration.

Tisch's plan would lop \$2 billion out of the state budget in one fell swoop. From bottom to top, services would be cut substantially. Items such as state police, corrections, education and social services would be cut.

Worse yet, local governments would lose as much as 30 percent of their budgets. No matter how much taxpayers believe there is waste in government, only the foolhardy believe spending should be cut by that much.

ON THE OTHER HAND, proposals such as those put together by state Rep. Mark Siljander, R-Three Rivers, and Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor, offer sound alternatives.

Siljander's proposal would cut property taxes which would be made up through an increased sales tax. Bullard's plan would shift state funding to the income tax.

These two proposals deal with equity, unlike Tisch's proposal which deals in unmitigated revenge.

Think before signing a petition. It's our state's future which is at stake.

Those who live in a climate that rarely changes — like Florida or San Francisco — are denied this change of lifestyle. Spring and fall are meaningless to them.



UNFORTUNATELY, even if she does all the right things, there are some people whose bodies are made for wearing clothes, and there are others


who look dumpy, even in the latest, most expensive fashions.

Then she added, "Remember, what you have in your head no one can steal from you." It was a remark that The Stroller has carried through life.



Get best zoo pictures on weekday morning

Modern zoos are doing away with cages as much as possible, designing habitats closely resembling the actual environment of the animals on exhibit.

This presents a tremendous opportunity to the photographer who wishes to capture an animal on film in his natural surroundings.

Let's start with equipment. Try to take only what you think you'll use.

In addition to your camera body, a long telephoto (300-400mm) and a short telephoto (100-135mm) will be adequate. A tripod and flash (for indoor exhibits and outdoor fill-in) round out the essential equipment.

Folks staying closer to home

Lots of folks will be going to the Detroit Zoo and spots near home this weekend. The Michigan Department of Transportation predicts holiday driving this weekend will be the lightest in five years.

Michigan motorists are expected to log 686 million miles over the four-day holiday — from noon Friday to noon Tuesday. That's 5 percent below the 722 million miles they drove in the 1979 Memorial Day weekend.

MDOT Director John P. Woodford has ordered all highway construction activity suspended from 3 p.m. Friday until working hours Tuesday.

The only metropolitan area detour is on I-75 freeway's northbound and southbound ramps to eastbound I-94 (Ford) freeway in Detroit. Those ramps are closed for bridge repair. A detour is posted.

SLOWDOWNS may occur at these points:

- I-96 in west Oakland County — the left lane in both directions is closed between I-275 and Novi Road for median barrier construction.
- US-24 (Telegraph) — intermittent closures in both directions between 12 Mile in Southfield and Maple Road in Bloomfield Township for reconstruction work.
- M-150 (Rochester Road) from Big Beaver to South Blvd. in Troy — periodic lane closures in both directions for widening and reconstruction.
- I-75 from Eight Mile to 12 Mile in southeast Oakland County — left lanes in both directions are closed for construction of median barriers.

Provisions for close-up photography will come in handy too.

THE BEST TIME for zoo photography is on a weekday morning when schools are in session. The animals will be rested, alert and free from the distractions of a noisy crowd, and you will be able to set up and shoot at leisure.

Like people, animals have distinct personalities. Some animals are active, some lazy; some are interested in us "humans" peering at them, and some are totally bored with us. Take time to study their movements and habits.

Watch their routines — animals tend to be very repetitious. Focus in on the part of the act you like, and shoot. Animals are active, and most alert, right before feeding, but mealtime can also result in interesting pictures. Shortly after feeding, most animals clean and groom themselves, and then it's siesta time. Each of these phases of animal behavior can offer rewarding photos.

CHECK THE BACKGROUND in your zoo pictures. Make them as natural as possible, avoiding telephone poles, fences and other zoo visitors.

If you have to deal with shooting through a fence, don't worry. Just place the lens right against the wire and use a wide lens opening to minimize depth of field. In the final picture, the fence won't even be there.

For outdoor shots in shadowed areas or with indoor exhibits, use your flash.


And don't let those snakes and lizards behind glass scare you off either. If you press the camera lens against the glass, all will be well, and unwanted natural and flash reflections will be eliminated.

Did you know zoos can offer much more than animal photography? Go on a weekend when there are swarms of people and observe other zoo visitors, especially the kids.

Children and their reactions to the different kinds of animals can result in prize-winning candid pictures showing amazement, humor and surprise.

What are we waiting for? Let's go to the zoo!

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MX missile funding stays intact

Here's how area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes May 8-14.

HOUSE

MX MISSILE — By a vote of 319-42, the House refused to cut \$1.6 billion from next year's Pentagon budget for researching and developing the proposed MX intercontinental missile. The amendment was offered to HR 6974, a defense spending bill later passed and sent to the Senate. The MX system is to be the nation's next generation of nuclear missiles, for defense or attack. The missiles may be housed in underground launch sites in western states.

Rep. Ronald Dellums, D-Calif., who favored deleting money for the missile, predicted the MX will prove too expensive and will "die of its own weight."

Rep. John Seiberling, D-Ohio, an opponent of cutting the funds, said that by developing the MX while negotiating with the Soviet Union, the U.S. would retain the "option of having an adequate counter to their new generation of missiles."

Members voting yea oppose the MX. Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, and William Brodhead, D-Detroit, voted yea.

Reps. William Ford, D-Taylor, James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge, and William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, voted nay.

FOOD STAMPS — The House approved, 345-56, an emergency appropriation of \$2.5 billion to keep the food stamp program alive through fiscal 1980, which ends Sept. 30. The Department of Agriculture provides the stamps to the poor to increase purchasing power at food stores. About 21.4 million persons benefit from the stamps. The average recipient gets about \$35 monthly in purchasing power at grocery stores.

Rep. Richard Bolling, D-Mo., a supporter, said that without the emergency funding "the secretary of agriculture will be forced to order states to suspend all food stamp benefits, effective June 1, to millions of poor and near poor Americans who cannot afford an adequate diet."

Rep. Robert Michel, R-Ill., an opponent, said: "We all know about the amount of waste, fraud and abuse in the food stamp program."

Members voting yea want to keep the food stamp program operational through Sept. 30 or later.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead, Blanchard and Broomfield voted yea. Pursell did not vote.

FREE FOOD STAMPS — By a vote of 289-112, the House refused to resume government charges for food stamps. Since 1979, individuals and families fitting the government's definition of poverty have been able to get the stamps for free. The vote came during debate on S 1309, a food stamps funding bill later signed into law.

Rep. Steven Symms, R-Idaho, a supporter, said that before the purchase requirement was abolished the food stamp program cost \$5.5 billion annually. "Now, without the purchase requirement, it is nearly \$11 billion."

Rep. Fred Richmond, D-N.Y., an opponent, said that reinstituting the purchase requirement would "actually reverse our entire food stamp program, increase fraud, increase error rate, and take the poorest of the poor people off the food stamp rolls."

Members voting yea want the government to resume charging for food stamps.

Broomfield voted yea. Pursell, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted nay.

Bonior did not vote.

SENATE

FOOD STAMPS — The Senate ap-

proved, 70-18, an appropriation of \$3 billion to continue the food stamp program through Sept. 30. The House approved a similar measure (see preceding votes), and the emergency money was headed for final congressional approval.

Sen. George McGovern, D-S.D., a supporter, called food stamps "a humanitarian program" that meets "the needs of the hungry and the poor . . . the most vulnerable citizens in our society."

Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, an opponent, said "one out of every 10 Americans is now drawing food stamps . . . That has to be a sign of something basically and fundamentally wrong in our society and with this kind of a program."

Senators voting yea want to fund the food stamp program at least through Sept. 30.

Sens. Donald Riegle and Carl Levin, both Democrats, voted yea.

FEDERAL PENSIONS — The Senate killed, 50 for and 43 against, a proposal to preserve the current semiannual cost-of-living pension increases for retired federal workers, including congressmen. The proposal, which

would have cost taxpayers \$400 million in 1981, was offered to the fiscal 1981 congressional budget blueprint (H Con Res 307). This vote means the cost-of-living hike is to be awarded only once annually.

Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., who favored killing the amendment, said that to balance the budget, Congress "must do away with expensive luxuries like the semiannual increases."

Sen. Charles Mathias, R-Md., who opposed killing the semiannual increases, said, "The Senate cannot condone holding the federal retirees hostage in its push to balance the budget."

Members voting yea favor only one cost-of-living increase per year for federal pensioners.

Levin voted yea.

Riegle voted nay.



Rocks sweep Belleville, win league baseball title

his fourth win of the year with a three-hitter in the nightcap. Using an effective curve ball, Primeau was able to handcuff the Tigers after allowing two runs in the first.

Throwing pinpoint control, the Salem senior struck out three and walked only one.

Trailing 2-0 in the bottom of the seventh, Salem rallied to tie the game and send it into extra innings.

Anderson started things off with a single. He came home on Woodard's double. Etienne then tied the game with another double, scoring Woodard.

John Murzin won the shot put with a heave of 48-9¾, Paul Bialowicz placed second in the long jump by leaping 20-8¾, and Brendan McCarthy was third in pole vault by clearing 12-7.

Salem's Bob Pittaway bested all comers in the shot put by hurling the discus 152-0. The Rocks placed third in the 400-meter relay with the quartet of Greg Lipka, Scott Bublin, Jim Spooner and Pittaway. The time was 44.94.

Livonia Churchill and Livonia Bentley each qualified two individuals in the field events.

Churchill's Rich Easton won the pole vault with a best effort of 12-7. Teammate Darrel Copley was third in the shot with a put of 46-10.

Pittaway, however, came back with a victory in the 100-yard dash. He posted a clocking of 10.5. Lipka gained second (10.6).

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

Art class discoveries: Painting and patience

Shirley Ford's painting classes have a way of dwindling in size. By the end of the 16-session course, the number of students usually decreases from the original 15 to about half.

But that's not all bad. Her students are inmates of the Detroit House of Correction, and the reason some of them drop out of her class is because of an early release from the institution.

Mrs. Ford likes to think the reason many of them receive an early release is because of their excellent behavior.

She has been teaching painting and drawing at the short-term prison on Five Mile Road in Plymouth Township for three years. She is there from 6-9 p.m. every Monday and Wednesday.

"I usually lose two after the first class when they decide it is not for them," she said. The others drop out at their residency at Dehoco ends.

"It's exciting, challenging and rewarding. The men come in hostile and uptight. I try to slow down the extrovert and cultivate a trusting rapport with the withdrawn. Once they're interested, they bring in a photograph of a child or relative, or find a picture in a magazine, and begin painting." Shirley is a portrait painter. Her students do portraits, landscapes, still life and seascapes.

She feels it is important to get there early to set up a display of their works and to get out the supplies.

"I WORK ON a one-to-one basis. At first, they don't talk to each other." She looks forward to the time when they start looking at each other's works, offering suggestions and making comments. Once a comfortable communication is established, they relax and begin to enjoy the class.

Written tests at the end of the course include a brief resume of the student's assessment of the classes.

"This one was 58 years old," explained Mrs. Ford, as she went through some of the test sheets.

"He was very disruptive at the first class — talked so fast, he didn't make sense. He painted six pictures the first night. Finally, with patience, his paint-

ing became slower and so did his speech. He did one or two a night and then one every two weeks.

"The time came when he sold some drawings," Mrs. Ford said. "He had developed a style. And see what he wrote!"

As the bottom of his test paper was: "I've learned how to be patient. New Life." His teacher wiped the tears from her eyes as she repeated, "New life."

"ONE OF MY students was a young man who was a natural artist. We developed his technique — the eyes and the skin tones. Several of his paintings were sold and when he was released, he went back to school. He's still painting."

Some of the other critiques of the art classes revealed why Mrs. Ford finds it all very rewarding. Pat McAlinden, director of treatment at Dehoco, said with a smile, "She's on cloud nine when she reads some of these." He also expressed enthusiasm over the results of the classes.

The men expressed their feelings:

"I learn to concentrate on objects and reproduce what I see. I find it helps my mind to create its own beauty. Learn to blend color and draw portraits and to capture still life."

"Listen to teacher, now I learned it pays to listen. Improved confidence."

"I've also gotten great enthusiasm from starting a project and completing a finished product with your help. Furthermore, it has

helped me to sharpen my comprehension to the point of being able to accept constructive criticism. To distinguish between the two, constructive and destructive. So at the same time, I also found something more about myself."

"Helped me bring out something I thought that I really couldn't do and, thanks to the teacher, I'm going to take another course when I get out. Thank teach for your helping bring out something in me."

"I, (name deleted), have learned how to draw and a great deal of patience and wish the classes was not over. Miss Ford is very nice teacher."

"As sketching has always been my weakest point, I feel that having gained this knowledge and skills, plus the reacknowledgment of my artistic gift which comes from God Almighty Jesus Christ, is the best contribution that this art class has affirmed to me after Ten (10) years abstention from art endeavors of any kind altogether."

Shirley Ford is very discreet about her students' backgrounds, maintaining a rigid attitude of disinterest in why they are in Dehoco. To her, they are individuals with undiscovered potentials.

She did say that the writer of the last class assessment had been a promising artist but hadn't touched it for 10 years. His pastel portraits of a turbaned, bearded man and beautiful



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Bethany helps heal hurt

They were all ages, came from all walks of life, and for most, this was their first meeting. "Welcome to Bethany," said James Jagielski.

"This isn't Father Jim's dating club," he said, "but if you see someone you like, that's OK."

Attending this meeting were 40 separated or divorced Christians. They get together monthly to share problems and give support.

Fr. Jagielski, who leads the group that meets in Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church of Plymouth, said the name is taken from the name of the city where Jesus went to get comfort from his friends.

"First Bethany is a social group," said the priest. "We also offer spiritual and educational support. But these are secondary."

"It is to help people through the trials and throes of the aftermath of divorce or separation."

Bethany is loosely organized, he told those gathered at OLCG.

"We want to keep it casual. Even though the organization is areawide, we are autonomous."

"There is no formal membership or dues, but donations are accepted to pay for coffee and mailing expenses. And if you decide to go out together after the meeting, it's Dutch treat. That's one of our rules."

THE BETHANY group meeting in Plymouth is just one of a dozen such organizations around the metropolitan Detroit area. What began in May 1966

with 18 Catholic women, now involves 800 men and women, Protestants as well as Catholics.

The organization was formally established with the Archdiocese of Detroit in 1975.

It was the Bethany groups in Detroit asked Cardinal John Dearden to celebrate the Mass for separated and divorced in March. Several hundred people attended the service in Detroit's Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

The mass represented the latest effort towards reconciliation between the church and divorced/separated Catholics.

"There are approximately 110,000 divorced Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit," said Bud Ozer, director of the archdiocese family life office. "With an average of 2.2 children per family, we have 300,000 people directly affected out of 1.5 million Catholics. This group provides a place for people who are hurting."

Fr. Jagielski said women are more willing to admit the hurt than men. This is why there usually seems to be more women attending the meetings than men.

"Also, guys can more easily to a bar to meet

people," said the priest, "and men have a macho image which means they don't show pain."

"They don't want to acknowledge that (divorce or separation) is difficult."

SISTER MARY LOUISE YURICK, adviser of Bethany in Farmington Hills, said that the thrust of her group is primarily educational.

"The people who come here," she said, "are looking for someone to give them information. This includes such things as dealing with loneliness, handling children and managing stress resulting from the breakup."

To provide this information, she invites speakers every month to help members rearrange the priorities in their lives and cope with the hurt.

"I view Bethany as a good thing," she said. "People who have been in the situation for two or three years are in a position of helping those who are just beginning to go through it."

Children are also a part of the Bethany program. Groups sometimes plan a day with children and their fathers or children and their mothers.

"The children hurt, too," said Ozer. "Sometimes kids may go through the divorce experience, but five or six years later, they still aren't reconciled because the parents are having a hard time with their own problems and have difficulty focusing on the child."

"The group tries to help both parents and child get through the experience."

"What Bethany says is, 'We have all felt a hurt and we hurt with you.'"

Sixteen members of area Presbyterian churches will serve on committees and sub-committees for the 192nd General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church in U.S.A., meeting May 27 through June 4 in Cobo Hall, Detroit.

More than 600 commissioners are expected in the area for the major event. Visitors, staff, clergy and lay persons will add another 5,000 persons to the scene.

General Assembly is the highest body in the denomination numbering 2.5 million nationwide. The annual convocation reviews the church's work, responds to issues of concern and makes decisions on numerous church matters.

Working on the preparations are representatives from 108 Presbyterian churches in the metropolitan area.

For the first time, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Canada will be meeting simultaneously, May 31 through June 4 in Windsor. The two gatherings will unite in an ecumenical service at 8 p.m. June 1, in Cobo Hall.

That day also will take commissioning delegates to various Presbyterian pulpits as guest speakers.

All General Assembly meetings are open to the public.

Ralph Kelley is named outstanding playwright

Ralph B. Kelley, a Plymouth resident who teaches English at Schoolcraft College, was named one of five outstanding playwrights in Michigan.

Kelley's script, "Goosey Goosey Gander" was one 54 entries submitted at a recent competition in Alpena of the Community Theatre Association of Michigan. His script tied for third place with one written by Dr. John Orr, a professor of English from Western Michigan University.

Top honors went to Dr. Gordon Laing and Richard Lewis of Kalamazoo who collaborated on their entry. Both are professional writers with credits in screen, stage and fiction writing. Dr. James Warner from Oakland Community College was given second place for a script entitled "Flight."

Dr. Thomas Small, professor of English at Western Michigan University, was chairman of the competition. Judges were from Kalamazoo and Ann Arbor.

KELLEY'S full length script presents a study on the status of women in a world of men ruled by poor logic.

The title stems from the idea that geese mate for life. Similarly, for humankind, one-man-one-wife is said to be the norm.

"There are exceptions to the rule about geese, and one might find a gander that does not remain loyal," explained Kelley as he discussed the inspiration for his script.

"When a gander is caught with two geese, he is destroyed by the flock," he recalls actually seeing this happen. "However, when a marriage is failing, humankind seek revenge and humiliation, a quality that places them not too far above the animal level. When a love goes sour, an endless round of revenge and humiliations begins. Seemingly, we do not know any other way that is said to be realistic in handling the hurt of a love which has ended."

This is not Kelley's first award for script writing. Because of his busy work schedule, he says he spends about a year on a script. He wrote the script for "The Burning Tree," a folk ballet commissioned by the Plymouth Symphony Society for the Bicentennial year and funded by a special grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts.

There's something about a Beth Jacob girl

Who ever heard of Chaya Feldman?

The name of Ann Frank is well-known because of the diary she wrote detailing the last days of her young life under the Nazi curse. But there weren't enough days remaining in Chaya Feldman's life to write a diary. Chaya left only one letter.

Chaya Feldman was a student of the Beth Jacob School for Girls in Cracow, Poland. The school was founded in 1923 by Sara Schenier, the daughter of a Hassidic rabbi who read a quotation written by ancient Jewish sages stating: "It is the women who in all nations and at all times have the greatest influence in the making of coming generations."

When the Nazi nightmare ended Chaya Feldman's life, the letter was found hidden in the crack of a wall at the school. It read:

"When this letter is found, I will belong to the past. We are 93 girls between the ages of 14 and 22. All of us are teachers or students of Beth Jacob."

"The day of July 27, Gestapo officers came and herded us from our homes and they cast us into a dark room. We have only water to drink. The younger girls are terrified, but I console them and tell them shortly we will meet and be together with our mother Sara Schenier."

"Yesterday they took us out of the dark room. They bathed us and took away all of our clothing. They left only shirts for our bodies. They told us that German soldiers will arrive to visit with us. We solemnly took an oath that we will die together. The Germans do not know that the bath they gave us was our Tvilah (ritual immersion) before our death."

"Each of us has prepared poison. When the soldiers come, we will drink the poison. Today we are saying Vidduy (the confessional prayers for the dying) all day long. We are not frightened at all. We have only one request. Recite the Kaddish (memori-

al prayer) for 93 Jewish daughters . . . Chaya Feldman of Cracow."

TODAY THE MEMORY of the Cracow Beth Jacob girls who died rather than violate God's law remains alive in our community. One of hundreds of Beth Jacob schools throughout the world, the Sally Allan Alexander-Beth Jacob School for Girls is in Beverly Hills in the former Valley Woods school. It was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Norman Allan of West Bloomfield Township in 1978 and named in memory of their daughter.

My own daughter, Evelyn, graduated as president of the 1977 class and my second daughter, Shoshana, is a B.J. third-grader.

There's something different about a Beth Jacob girl. Fashion magazines cannot dictate to them, because both at school and at home, they dress in accordance with Jewish tradition. Skirts must cover the knees, sleeves be-

yond the elbow and collar bones indicate where a proper neckline should belong. Slacks and shorts are taboo. The only thing a Beth Jacob girl will reveal in public is her brains.

"If I don't try very hard to get high grades," Evelyn once told me, "I won't have any friends."

AFTER OBTAINING their teaching certificates, many Beth Jacob girls return to the school as faculty members. Hindel Goldstein Greenfield, daughter of school principal Rabbi Sholom Goldstein, returned to become a first-grade Hebrew teacher. Shoshana was in her class, and I am alive today because she learned her lessons well.

I was nine months pregnant with Yaakov Meir when the doctor gave me permission to fast on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. The fast, which consists of no food or drink, lasts at least 26 hours. All Jews beyond age of 12 for girls and 13 for boys must fast.

By mid-afternoon on that Yom Kippur, I decided to retire to bed because I was extremely sleepy. Minutes later Shoshi appeared with a plate of cake and a glass of milk.

"You have to eat this. Mrs. Greenfield told us in class that a person isn't allowed to fast if they're sick," Shoshi insisted. "Life is the most important thing, and you're allowed to put your life in danger only if you were going to save someone else's life."

At first I refused. But Shoshi was persistent. Throughout the afternoon she kept giving me food and drink.

The following day I decided to visit my obstetrician. When I told him what had happened on Yom Kippur, he answered:

"Your daughter saved your life and the baby. You weren't sleepy. You were going into a coma. You are very sick and I'm admitting you to the hospital immediately. My diagnosis is pre-eclampsia."

LAST SUMMER Hindel Greenfield died one month after the birth of her first child. An unsuspected blood clot claimed her life. Her father continues to educate each Beth Jacob girl as if she were his own daughter. Perhaps that's why when they graduate, they express sentiments like these words written by Devorah Laymen and Evelyn Krieger.

"Looking back through time our first day — open arms waiting to embrace us. Direction. Acceptance. Small things forever cherished. New surrounding envelope us. Torah and Yiddishkeit, trials and tribulations. Beginning a long journey wondering where it would lead to. Entering a world of learning guiding us through the years. Growing. Changing. Striving to achieve love of God, friends. Walking together, becoming a part of it all. Beth Jacob — it has shaped our lives. The hour glass has slowly run out opening new dimensions in Time."

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
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
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

Exorcism can bless as well as expel evil

For Mother's Day, I gave my grandmother a gold cross on a chain. I was greatly surprised when she told me she would take it to the priest and have it exorcised before wearing it.

She seemed to like it very much, but what was she talking about? I thought exorcism was to cast out evil spirits from a person's body.

Has my grandmother become senile, or did she think the gift I gave her was evil? Kathy S., Livonia

Dear Kathy,

Neither one. There are three kinds of exorcism. However, since the advent of Michael Blaty's book, "The Exorcist," and the movie made from it, most people think of exorcism in only one way.

The expulsion of a foreign spirit from the body of a human being by a command, ritual, or prayer is called exorcism.

In addition to these rituals, there are also exorcisms to rid houses or other buildings and places of ghosts that are haunting the premises.

But the most common form of exorcism practiced is that of blessing metals, jewelry, or other objects. This is practiced in many religious orders. Catholic priests, as well as witches and many others, ask blessings upon cups used for drinking, homes to be lived in, and even clothes to be worn.

In all cases, the one performing the ritual calls upon God (by whatever name he knows that one Supreme Being), and asks that the object be blessed.

In many such rituals, the four elements, earth, air, fire, and water, are used. Usually salt is used to represent the earth, incense for the fire, and air, and — of course — water that has itself been blessed and made holy.

Did you know that

Michigan asparagus soon will be abundant in the stores and it is a treat dieters can enjoy — just 66 calories per pound. Michigan ranks third in asparagus production, harvesting 22,100,000 pounds from 17,000 acres in 1979. Asparagus is believed to have come from Asia Minor and has been valued for medicinal properties.

Eating foods low in saturated fats and cholesterol safely lowers blood cholesterol. But fats are essential to the function of the body and should not be eliminated. They carry Vitamins A, D, E and K into the body, keep skin healthy and keep us from getting the hungry feeling right after a meal.

Starchy foods should not be eliminated from the diet. In fact, they should be a part of the diet — in moderation. They are a good source of fiber and essential vitamins and minerals. The food group contains grains, potatoes, breads and noodles.

THE GREATER the excess weight a person carries, the greater the risk for coronary heart disease. Losing weight will not prevent heart disease but will reduce the effect of risk factors. Obese people also are more prone to having higher blood pressure and high blood cholesterol, and they are more likely to become diabetics and more likely to be physically active.

Since one pound of fat contains 3,500 calories, this is the number of calories that must be eliminated from the diet in one week to lose one pound. That is the equivalent of 500 calories less per day.

A dinner party in China during the

Middle Ages included as many as 40 different dishes. Lots of rice, 20 vegetables, and all kinds of soups were included. The soups were often made from bird's tongue, deer's head, lamb's paw and fried wolf.

The primary purpose of growing tomatoes today is for eating. But this not has always been so. Thomas Jefferson was one of the first in the country to grow tomatoes, but he used them only for decoration.

DIGESTING FOOD food may take as little as three hours or as long as 11


depending on what you eat. Whatever food you eat, it must travel through 25 feet of intestinal track, no matter how tall you are.

Processed foods are high in salt content. Most Americans eat more salt than they should. To bring down your salt intake, don't add it while cooking or at the table. Processed foods that are the main offenders include meat tenderizer, barbecue sauce, bouillon cubes, canned fish, catsup, monosodium glutamate (MSG), soy sauce, and sausages. Also included are processed cheeses, canned soups, frozen entrees, TV dinners and the salty snack foods.

Vitamin K is essential to the clotting of blood. One kind of the vitamin occurs in plants. Another is formed by bacteria in the intestinal tract. A deficiency causes hemorrhage and liver injury. Vitamin K is found in spinach, lettuce, kale, cabbage, cauliflower, liver and egg yolk.

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
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

Teeth to trumpets

A dentist turns to Dixieland

His slicked-back dark hair makes this intense man appear to be an anachronism from the jazz age. His dark horn-rimmed glasses do nothing to detract from this image.

When he plays his horn, the years roll back and it could be 1928 and prohibition could be in full force.

But this is 1980 and the trumpet player is not Bix Beiderbecke but a Grosse Pointe dentist. Dr. Chet Bogan is the serious man who drills teeth by day and blows a hot trumpet at night as leader of the Wolverine Jazz Band.

In addition to Bogan's exciting and authentic trumpet, several local musicians help bolster the Wolverine's claim to being the finest traditional Dixieland band around.

Clarinetist Wally Troniano of Southfield has been a studio musician and a member of the Red Garter Band and the Tailgate Ramblers. Banjo player Steve Zelle of Southfield has performed with the Eagle Jazz Band of Cleveland and the Cake-Walking Jazz Band.

Trombone player Stu Sanders of Livonia has played with Tex Beneke and has backed Peggy Lee, Tony Bennett and Frank Sinatra, among other well-known singers.

DRUMMER MIKE Pokriefka of Warren has performed with the Zug Island All-Stars, the Surf-Side Six and the Tailgate Ramblers. Tom Saunders of Detroit has played the tuba in the Red Garter Band and the New McKinney's Cotton Pickers.

Attractive red-haired Elma Santa of Southfield is the well-known singer, Dixie Belle, who has appeared in a variety of musical settings from coast to coast.

Music has always been bandleader Bogan's hobby, thanks to his ineptitude at sports.

"I was lousy at sports and I was always disappointed that you only got three strikes in baseball," Bogan said recently.

Although he makes his living as a dentist, Bogan considers dixieland jazz more than a hobby.

"I'm not doing this strictly for kicks," he confided. "I want to be known as the leader of a fine jazz band."

Dyed-in-the-wood Dixieland fans who have heard the band are convinced Bogan has one of the finest traditional jazz bands in the country. Some fans were so convinced at the band's appearance

during the Central Illinois Jazz Festival last February, they got up a petition demanding the band be allowed to play more often than scheduled.

WHO COULD ARGUE with aroused jazz fans? Certainly not the festival management, who quickly juggled the schedule.

Organized since 1970, the Wolverine Jazz Band has gained the kind of reputation that gets it frequent invitations to traditional jazz festivals around the country and in Europe. Although Bogan and the other band members have to work for a living, they are always ready to pack their bags and head for a festival.

This year the band will appear again at the Bix Beiderbecke Festival in Davenport, Iowa, and over the Memorial Day weekend will be featured at the seventh annual Dixieland Jazz Jubilee in Sacramento, Calif.

The band makes infrequent appearances in Oakland County but has played every Tuesday night for more than three years at Lido-on-the-Lake in St. Clair Shores.

For several hours, beginning at 9 p.m. every Tuesday, the Wolverine Jazz Band entertains a packed house at the Lido with a dazzling display of traditional jazz. The band runs through a jazz repertoire straight from the '20s.

WITH ARRANGEMENTS by Bogan, the tunes of Jelly Roll Morton alternate with the blues and traditional numbers such as "Tin Roof Blues." Bogan's strong and driving trumpet leads the band through its paces. Ensemble playing is well-arranged and the solos smooth and witty.

Bluegrass

Out of the hills, on to the stage

Stompin', pickin' and kickin'. That's bluegrass music.

It's music born in the rural south in the '30s when Bill Monroe added a syncopated beat to mountain songs and came up with a painkiller for the Depression.

To this day, most bluegrass performers are purists, avoiding the modern trappings of electric guitars and 16-track recording studios for the low-tech life of bars and festival shows.

"At many colleges and universities we're billed as 'folk music,' but that's all right with us," says Roy McGinnis of the Sunnysiders, a bluegrass group that performs throughout Michigan.

"We never want to dilute our music with electric instruments or drums, like country music has been diluted into rock."

THE SUNNYSIDERS are one of seven bluegrass bands invading Meadow Brook's Baldwin Pavilion — best known as the summer home of the Detroit Symphony — for this Sunday's Motor City Bluegrass Festival.

Along with the Sunnysiders, the Red Clay Ramblers, the Hotmud Family, Unexpected Company, Livingston County Grass, Acme Bluegrass and the Costabella Cloggers will perform continuously, noon to 10 p.m.

Tickets are \$6 (free for children under 15), available at Hudson's and CTC outlets. For more information, call 577-4204.

"There's a lot of folks in Detroit who never heard real bluegrass music at all, and I hope they'll come out and find out what it's all

about," says Larry McDaniel, organizer of the festival and drawl-voiced host of the "Arkansas Traveler" show on WDET-FM.

"Lots of folks who listen to my program came up from the South. They miss hearin' bluegrass music, cause you don't hear it anywhere in these parts — not the real thing, anyway."

"People are callin' me up all the time and they want to know what is this music and how come they never heard it before, and so on. I also throw in some blues, stringband, jugband and gospel music, and most folks seem to like it."

WITH ITS RURAL background, bluegrass lyrics often tell stories of home, family and poverty, using banjos, fiddles, mandolins and maybe a dulcimer. And by its nature, bluegrass is rarely heard on record.

"Bluegrass music was born when people got together on the back porches and at barn-raisin's, wedding's and community gatherin's," says McDaniel.

"To really perform bluegrass, you need a live audience. I've always said that Henry Ford did as much for bluegrass as anybody when he invented the pickup truck around 1926. That provided transportation for the mountain people to get together for festivals."

Dixie Belle gets her share of vocals, as she twirls her long beads and waves her feather boa to cap off a vocal or emphasize a lyric. Her smooth, at times almost soft, voice is in pleasant contrast to many rough-voiced Dixieland vocalists who shout the blues. When she sings a Bessie Smith tune like "Put It Right There," her beguiling manner belies the clear fact that she knows exactly what those lyrics mean.

Chet Bogan, it turns out, was a pianist until he was in college. "I switched to trumpet," he confessed, "because I wanted to play an instrument that would let me be heard." He was tired of playing in the background as well as on out-of-tune pianos.

After graduating from the University of Detroit, Bogan was a dental technician in the Army during World War II. Because he was a musician, he was assigned to play in the Special Services Band at Fort Ord.

For six months in 1944, he played in a quintet which included Count Basie's drummer Jo Jones and great tenor saxophone player Lester Young, also originally out of the Basie band.

Bogan learned a lot from that brief experience. "I saw how fussy those two were about their instruments and their playing. Nothing was taken for granted. They always had their instruments under control."

THEY ALSO taught him about jazz. "In jazz, I learned, you have to get your idea in mind and know what your horn can do. What comes out has to be pleasant and lyrical."

Back in the Detroit area and out of dental school, Bogan played with Hal Gordon, WXYZ radio's music director, and with the big band of Carl Esson. His interest in Dixieland music was sparked by playing with Alexander's Ragtime Band and filling in with Pee Wee Hunt when he came to Detroit.

A mass chorus presentation will set a world record for number of singers on a stage at any one time — and as such will be entered in the Guinness Book of Records.

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

Full of paranoia and despair, the films are as bleak as some of Sweden's landscapes. Just what have the Swedes got to be so guilty about, anyway?

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
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

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

TRYING TO CONTAIN

White now rolls a six-two.
What does white do?

White's only hope is to hit and contain black's lone checker, which this move doesn't come close to doing. Black could easily pass the 11 point on the next roll or stay back with a small roll and break off the two checkers from the 6 point, leaving white a single indirect shot.

Another idea might be for white to move the back checker from black's 5 point to black's 11 point for the six move, and then play the two roll in his home field. This would leave two open blots waiting for black's lone checker, but they are too close to have any real containing value.

BEST OVERALL PLAY.

If black doesn't hit white's blot with a one on the next roll, he will probably be forced to run to the outer field and leave a direct shot for white's back checker.

If black does hit white with a one on the next roll, white will have two checkers in black's home field

"It's a part that fits me. The old poop is eccentric, and so am I," Ellerbe said last week.


"I WAS MENTALLY not attuned to playing old men," he said. But when the transition finally came, it was difficult for him.

Wine report shows how tastes change

A recent issue of "Wines and Vines," trade publication of the American wine industry, carries a series of production reports. These provide interesting insights into the world of the California wine industry and, because most of the wines drunk in this area are from there, into our wine habits as well.

They report on the 1979 crush, compare the acreage in 1967 with 1979 and report wine sales volumes. What is planted is, of course, what will be available to us in the coming years.

Among wine grapes, the most heavily planted is French Colombard, followed by Carignane and Grenache — none produce wines to base a reputation on. The lowest volume planted in the state are White (Johannisberg) Reisling and Chardonnay, California's two great whites.

The combined acreage of the esteemed Pinot Noir and Petite Sirah grapes is no larger than that planted to the unglorious hybrid Rubired, a grape few of us ever hear anything about. And Cabernet Sauvignon and Zinfandel together don't equal the amount of Carignane planted. Oh, those jugs.

THE GREATEST increase in acreage between 1969 and 1979 was realized by Barbera and Ruby Cabernet. Both are up from about 1,000 acres each to about 20,000. Even with the great demand for white wine, these two grew at a faster rate than Chardonnay, White Riesling, Chenin Blanc and French Colombard.

It is interesting to speculate that while Zinfandel acreage has increased very little, in the decade it has changed from being used almost exclusively in jugs to being one of the top premium varietals.

The last set of figures reports sales of reds, whites and roses. White wines, of course, continue to dominate, up 22 percent between 1978 and 1979.

Rose has now replaced red wine in the number two position, up 4 percent in the last year, while red wine production is down 5 percent. The gallonage is 114, 53 and 49 million respectively for the three.

It seems as though the national trend toward lighter products has manifested itself in the red-rose distinction as well. Add to this the recent estimate that nearly a quarter of all wines consumed in America are drunk "on the rocks."

This suggests that a forthcoming column should discuss rose wines. And so it will.

He admits the market is overflowing with performers' autobiographies.

"I don't have any illusions about it. I don't force it. Only yesterday was I able to write down a thing about John Barrymore."

BARRYMORE AND Ellerbe were not appearing in the same play but were in theaters next door to each other in New York. Ellerbe said he and Barrymore's daughter Lana had become great friends. "I wrote about his last opening night," Ellerbe said.

Ellerbe has been coming to Meadow Brook for 10 years, and George S. Kaufman and Moss Hart's Pulitzer Prize-winning comedy "You Can't Take It With You" is his 13th play there.

"As a young actor, physically, I never seemed to change," he said.

Looking so young and playing youthful parts, he said, was a lot of work for him: "I had a lot of close friends who had aged properly. Suddenly this change came."

After his instant aging, the actor found his career "was at a standstill for quite a while."

Gregory Peck, a friend of Ellerbe's, came to the rescue by casting him as Edward Chamberlyn in T.S. Eliot's "The Cocktail Party" at a summer theater in LaJolla, Calif.

Ellerbe's next break came when Terence Kilburn, Meadow Brook's artistic director, hired him to play the father role in Eugene O'Neill's "Ah, Wilderness!"

"I FELL IN LOVE with the theater and the audiences. I hinted and begged to come back. I've been coming back for 10 years," Ellerbe said.

Last October, he played the role of the crippled ranch hand with the dog in the Meadow Brook production of Steinbeck's "Of Mice and Men." Ellerbe would rather play comedy than serious drama, however.

"It's harder and it's very satisfying," he said. "To deliver a line correctly can be very difficult. That's why I love this play. Grandpa is very funny."

Often, the soft tone in his voice hints at his origin as a Southerner. He was born in South Carolina but calls Atlanta his base, since he went through high school there.

The grey-haired actor first embarked on his pastime of writing after a woman heading the Georgia State Archives asked him at a cocktail party to tell her about Ethel Barrymore.

SHE SUGGESTED he write it down, and he read it a week later. "It fascinated me, as if I had nothing to do with it," Ellerbe said.


This longtime stage actor has done a lot of television and movies but dislikes both. He said he had the most horrible experience of his life in the entertainment industry doing a TV movie sequence filmed in Savannah.

He had to stand outside all day waiting for his turn before the camera.

"My eyelids were frozen. I couldn't think. When they sent me the check, I thought it was a mistake."

Even though the money was unbelievable, it was so much, Ellerbe is still not happy with television.

"I loathe it. I don't like to look at it," he said.
