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26 toss hats for 7 township board seats

A record number of candidates have filed nominating petitions for seven seats on the Canton Board of Trustees.

The 26 board hopefuls include five supervisor candidates, five treasurer candidates and 15 candidates for four trustee positions.

Incumbent Clerk John Flodin is the only candidate who will run unchallenged. Flodin has served as township clerk since 1976.

The deadline for filing nominating petitions was 4 p.m. Tuesday.

WITH THE EXCEPTION of Treasurer Jim Donahue, all present members of the township board will launch campaigns in preparation for the Aug. 5 primary.

Seeking re-election is Supervisor Noel Culbert, Clerk Flodin, and trustees Carol Bodenmiller, Stephen Larson and Eugene Daley.

Trustee Robert Greenstein will vie for the Democratic supervisor's nomination in the August primary. Greenstein served as Canton's supervisor from 1974 to 1976.

He will face two other candidates with supervisor experience in the Democratic primary.

Harold Stein, who served as supervisor from 1976 to 1978, has thrown his hat into the political arena along with incumbent Supervisor Culbert.

Another former board member — James Poole — will seek the supervi-

sor's nomination on the Republican ticket. He served as township trustee from 1974 to 1976.

Anna Bradley, Canton's treasurer from 1976 to 1978, has stepped back on the campaign trail with a bid for the Democratic treasurer's nomination.

One candidate she will face in August is deputy treasurer Maria Falkiewicz. Mrs. Falkiewicz has undertaken the administrative aspects of the treasurer's job since early spring because of the illness of the elected treasurer, Jim Donahue.

Several candidates for other township offices sit currently on the planning commission and other committees. They include Robert Padgett, Dianne Neihengen, Thomas Carman, Larry Bowerman and Robert Schaeztl.

FLODIN ATTRIBUTES the record number of candidates to Canton's rising population — now estimated at 50,000 — and a new state law, which makes all seven board seats expire concurrently.

In the past, the terms of the elected supervisor, clerk and treasurer expired after two years. Trustees were elected to four-year positions. Three administrative jobs and two trustee seats were up for grabs in previous elections.

But in November, seven candidates will be elected to four-year positions.

Under township board action, the treasurer's job will become a full-time position following the November election. In the past, the treasurer has been

charged with a 20-hour work week.

"I think the people in Canton are very active politically," Flodin said of the large number of candidates. "I think this reflects their interest in politics."

Supervisor candidate Poole and Clerk Flodin are the only board hopeful with assured spots on the November ballot.

Poole is the only supervisor candidate running as a Republican. No one has challenged Flodin's re-election bid.

In order to win a spot on the August primary ballot, candidates were required to submit 89 valid signatures from Canton residents. The clerk's office will review the validity of the signatures this week.

According to Flodin, candidates have until Friday to withdraw their bid for a party nomination.

Voters face selection of candidates, financial issues on Monday's ballot

Residents voting in Monday's school election will have four decisions to make — the selection of two candidates for trustee, and a yes-no vote on two ballot proposals.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday, June 9.

On the ballot will be the names of seven candidates running for two four-year positions on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The name of one resident (Emil Hagopian) will appear on the ballot even though he has decided against running for the school board. That decision was made after the deadline to withdraw his name from the ballot.

The active candidates are incumbents Flossie Torda of Canton and Richard Arlen of the city of Plymouth, and the following challengers: James Steffen of Canton, James Sinclair of Plymouth Township, Dennis Holyoak of

Canton, and Glen Schroeder of Plymouth Township.

THERE ALSO will be two ballot proposals, the exact language of which follows:

Proposition I

Approval to Levy Authorized Millage Rate: Shall the authorized millage rate for operating purposes of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, Michigan, be approved for levy in 1980 without regard to reduction required by section 9, of the state constitution of 1963?

Proposition II

Bonding Proposition — Primarily for Building Improvements and Energy Management: Shall Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, Michigan, borrow

the sum of not to exceed Eleven Million Dollars (\$11,000,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for the purpose of remodeling, constructing, refurbishing and re-equipping school district facilities; purchasing and equipping portable classroom facilities; and developing and improving sites?

THE FIRST ballot proposal asks voters to re-approve the same millage level (35.26 mills) for operation which now is being levied.

Without this approval the school district would have to roll back its operational levy by 1.26 mills to 34 mills (\$34 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation) because of the requirements of the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment.

Although the tax base has increased in the total school community, the district is receiving less in state aid, ac-

cording to Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business.

Hoedel points out the district will receive \$2.1 million less in state aid for 1980-81 and will lose another \$300,000 to \$750,000 from executive order cut-backs expected from the governor.

Dr. John Hoben, superintendent of schools, says the district will lose a little more than \$1 million if it must roll back the 1.26 mills.

"We are still in a time of continued student growth with enrollment rising by 500 to 700 students each year," said Hoben.

"We also are coping with the pressures of inflation which continues to increase the costs of textbooks, teaching supplies, utilities and maintenance costs."

"At this point in it is very important for the voters to give us permission to (Continued on Page 3A)

Tornado blasts baffle citizens

Last Friday's tornado warning in many of southeastern Michigan counties left more than a few folks shaken, rattled and confused.

Surprisingly, it wasn't just the bad weather that caused the alarm.

Many people, hundreds in some cases according to local officials, weren't sure just what was expected of them when sirens were sounded in Plymouth and Canton Townships.

In Canton Township, Fire Chief Mel Paulin reports his department "got quite a few calls" from concerned residents that night.

Cops probe man's death

The Wayne County Medical Examiner's Office is still investigating the death of a 20-year-old landscape worker, who collapsed May 24 after pounding his head on a brick wall.

The man died in Wayne County General Hospital shortly after the incident. According to Canton police, the employee of B&M Landscaping Co. was laying sod at a home on Kingsway on the day of his death.

The man complained of cramps in his legs and arms and told his co-workers that he would rest in the car, according to Lt. Larry Stewart.

Instead, the man drove to Queensway — the next street in the subdivision near Cherry Hill and Lilley. Stewart said the man jumped out of his car and began pounding his head on the outside wall of a subdivision home. He ran to house across the street and repeated the action.

Canton rescue workers were called to the scene after the man collapsed.

Police will not release the man's name until the autopsy report is completed. According to Stewart, the man lived in Belleville.

One woman, perturbed by the activated sirens, said they "bothered" her kids.

During the blasts, a handful of residents responded by arriving at Township Hall for shelter. After sitting and chatting in the meeting room, they left when the sirens stopped.

In Plymouth Township, phones rang off the hook.

"I estimate there was upwards of a couple of hundred (calls) between the two watches," says Plymouth Township Fire Chief Larry Groth. "Some people just wanted to know what they were hearing was true. Others were upset that the sirens woke them up."

IN THE CITY of Plymouth, Police Chief Tim Ford says he wasn't aware of any city sirens going off that night. In fact, he said while he's been chief, they (sirens) haven't been tested.

But Friday's incident has prompted

Ford to establish a new policy for informing the public.

To familiarize people with the sound of such sirens, and their message, the city will begin sounding them at noon on the first Saturday of each month. The blasts will run one minute.

"In the future, we'll begin testing them (on the first Saturday of the month), beginning April 1," he said.

Groth explained his department's procedure for notifying residents of Plymouth Township during a tornado warning.

The first step is that during a tornado watch — which means favorable conditions exist for the formation of a tornado — a firefighter is dispatched to the township's highest point (near Napier Road and the M-14 freeway) as an observer.

Then, if a tornado warning is dispatched, which means a sighting has been made, a 3-5 minute steady siren

blast is activated. This means residents should "take cover."

It's during this time that all the township's volunteers and off-duty firefighters are called into the department's stations. This happened in Plymouth Township during both warnings near 5:30 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. last Friday and Saturday.

Once the department receives notice of safe conditions, it sounds an "all clear" alert. In this case, sirens are sounded in three one-minute intervals, with one-minute breaks in between.

Here are some standard safety measures to take once a tornado warning is announced.

In one's home, a basement offers the best safety. Seek shelter under sturdy furniture if possible. In homes without basements, take cover in the center of the house on the lowest floor in a small room, such as a closet or bathroom.

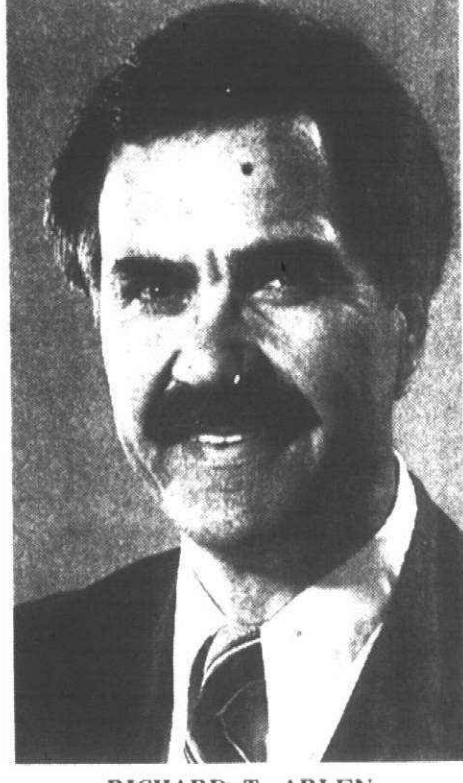

levy the same tax rate for the coming year as we now are collecting."

Hoben added that if both bond proposals failed the district would have to cut from \$1.9 to \$2.6 million from programs and even if both proposals passed the board still would have to cut from \$250,000 to \$950,000, depending upon the amount the governor cuts back state aid payments.

Hoedel added that revenues are increasing by 6.7 percent over last year while expenses have increased by 16.3 percent.

The increase in revenues is due to the increase in the taxbase (SEV). For

the coming year the tax base is expected to reach about \$835 million while this year it is almost \$674 million.

THE SECOND proposition seeks voter approval for the district to borrow \$11 million for 17 years at a maximum interest rate of 10 percent.

If approved, the debt retirement levy would increase by 1.07 mills for school year 1980-81 and would then decrease each year thereafter until dropping below the current level after three years.

The millage rate declines because the district pays off some of its existing debt and because of the projected increase in taxbase.

The added 1.07 mills, the added cost next year would be \$32 for the owner of a \$60,000 home, \$37 for the owner of a \$70,000 house, \$43 for the owner of a \$80,000 house, and \$53 for the owner of a \$100,000 home.

The \$11 million will be used to buy 20 portable classroom units at a cost of \$400,000, to buy furniture and other equipment at a cost of \$100,000 for Lowell Junior High, to invest \$1.5 million in air-conditioning to expand the use of Extended School Year (ESY) to other elementary buildings, and \$3.5 million for a major renovation of Central Middle School.

The bond issue also will be used to buy an energy management system which will monitor use of gas and electricity in all school buildings. The system is expected to pay for itself within five to seven years and then continue to save in operating costs, says Hoedel.

The \$11 million also includes funds to be spent on maintenance, renovation and improvements at individual school buildings throughout the district. Amounts planned to be spent at individual buildings include:

Allen, \$281,000; Bird, \$249,000; Eriksson, \$98,000; Farrand, \$258,000; Fiegel, \$121,000; Field, \$98,000; Gallimore, \$239,000; Hulsing, \$98,000; Isbis-

ter, \$75,000; Miller, \$445,000; Smith, \$153,000; Starkweather, \$230,000; Tanger, \$94,000; Truesdell, \$5,000; East, \$687,000; West, \$517,000; Pioneer, \$764,000; Central, \$3.5 million; Plymouth Salem High, \$731,000; Plymouth Canton High, \$650,000.

Also: Central administration building, \$75,000; central maintenance building, \$133,000; pupil services building and bus yard, \$283,000; fleet service garage, \$426,000.

BERNICE NICHOLS, election worker for the school district, reported Tuesday that the level absentee voter

activity is much lower than in March's special election.

As of Tuesday, only 68 persons had returned absentee ballots.

Residents who are 60 or older or who know they will be out of town June 9 may vote by absentee ballot from 9 a.m. up until 2 p.m. Saturday, June 7.

Absentee ballots are available in the school board offices at 454 S. Harvey, city of Plymouth, by appearing in person during normal working hours or on Saturday.

School voting precincts are different from city and township precincts. Residents who are unsure about where they should vote may call 453-0200, ext. 422.

W-W residents will fill 2 school board seats Moranty to 'communicate'

Financial problems and lack of communication are the two biggest issues facing Wayne-Westland Community Schools this year.

The Westland resident said that 20 years in industrial management with General Motors Corp. has given him an understanding of fiscal management.

"If you consider programs without looking at finances, programs will go down the tube," he said. "The board must be a motivating influence for change. We need a balanced budget."

Moranty said he wanted to help "maintain one of the finest systems in the state." He said that the vocational education center being built by the district will "fill in a gap for the bulk of

the kids, but I hope that financially we can operate it. Everything we do has a direct relationship to finances and management. We are so heavily reliant on state aid."

"I'm afraid we're gradually pricing ourselves out of education," he said. "Our budget is 90 percent for wages, salaries and benefits. There's not much left for fixed costs."

He said he believes that teachers have a right to strike, but added that "safeguards" must be added to legislation under consideration in Lansing for the benefit of taxpayers and parents.

Moranty wants future negotiations to have more communications made with the board. He said that lack of commu-

nication creates a morale problem.

"It's not what you do, it's what you appear to do that creates mistrust," he added. "How can you expect the community to become involved when they're not aware of what's going on? When they do get involved they're not told everything."

There is a "fine line" between the roles of the board and school administration, according to Moranty.

"Sometimes board members meddle and that's not their purpose," he said. "There are problems if there isn't a knowledge of broad aspects."

He also said the district needs to plan further ahead and learn from its mistakes.

Budget worries Anderson

Budget reviews and program modifications are needed to avoid future millage increases, according to Glenn Anderson, a candidate from Westland.

"I'd never cut out programs that I feel are a benefit to the community, but the district is running at a deficit and hasn't set aside debts built up in the past," he said.

Anderson said his main concern is to improve the school system. "I want it to be better than it is — more efficient and with better programs."

Declining enrollment is a "severe problem," according to Anderson. He also believes that the "basics of education" must equip a student "handle the outside world."

"One of the greatest problems is those who don't go to college aren't trained to support themselves in the outside world," he added, describing himself as a "strong advocate of vocational education."

The district's vocational education center can't be set and allowed to "run itself. It needs continuous reviewing for efficiency and for its programs."

Anderson believes the district must look for alternate methods of financing education that won't diminish local control, such as sales or income taxes and the state lottery.

Tax increases can be held to a minimum, according to Anderson, by cutting administrative costs. He said that

instructional salaries for aides and substitutes also "appear to be too high."

Communication to parents is important, he believes, "so they will feel their opinion really does matter. Then there would be greater involvement."

Board members shouldn't be just policy makers, says Anderson.

"I would visit classes in all schools to form opinions on which programs are really working," he said.

While he believes in the right to strike, Anderson said he is opposed to regional bargaining and favors binding arbitration over strikes. Anderson said he believes his experience in collective bargaining would be an asset on the board.

Arbour rejects Tisch tax plan

Mary Arbour, a Westland resident, sees her campaign for the board as the "culmination of everything else I have done for kids."

"Finances are the biggest issue facing education, but it's not an issue between candidates," she said.

"I see Tisch (property tax reduction) on the ballot in November and I'm scared for the district and for all schools," she continued. "We have to educate people that if this is in effect, it could really hurt us in the last half of the year. I see it as a threat to our educational system."

Mrs. Arbour said she believes "something has to be done about property taxes so that those on fixed incomes aren't overburdened." She said she favors a sales tax or income tax to replace the property tax.

The Wayne-Westland foundation is another idea that will help with financing special school needs, but not salaries, through donations.

The "overall picture" shows that the district is

doing an "exceptional" job, said Mrs. Arbour.

"There's always room to upgrade programs and revise goals," she added. "Our vocational education center and retraining program will be very effective. And the program of total learning with early intervention is good."

"Test scores aren't everything. We have to see that these kids have skills so that when they leave (school) they can get a job or go on to an institution of higher learning," Mrs. Arbour said.

Board members must be open and good listeners, according to Mrs. Arbour.

"As one member, you can't solve the problems of the district or of every parent, but you can direct them to the right person," she continued. "(Board members) are policy makers who don't interfere in the administration of a school."

Regional bargaining would pose a loss of autonomy to the district, believes Mrs. Arbour. But she said she does believe that teachers have a right to strike.

Batterson pushes career needs

Wayne resident Mildred "Mickey" Batterson, the only incumbent in the race, thinks that financing education and providing career direction are two of the biggest issues facing the district.

"Because of the governor's cuts in aid to education, we're preparing three different budgets," she explained. "We're looking ahead. Where we're going is depending on money."

Financial controls will come in the areas of programs and salaries, she said.

Students are going to need more career direction and exploration "outside traditional roles. A number of things have to be explored," she said. "Where are the jobs going to be in the future?"

Another area of concern to Ms. Batterson is "better utilization of schools. We have to do long-range planning, and we need to expand the continuing education program. It enhances life dramatically for

us as persons."

She also said that the whole community should get involved "not just in school use, but in programs, energy planning and school calendar. They just need to let it be known that they're interested."

Ms. Batterson said she believes that "in general, communication in the district is good. A lot of it is how much effort people put out. They have to be interested in what's going on."

Board members have to be able to look at the issues, ask questions and make decisions "when they have to," Ms. Batterson added. "You have to be involved in the process and look at an issue from all sides before you make a decision."

"My view is that a board member is responsible to everyone in a community, not just one group," she continued. "I see the whole scope of education changing as we go down the line."

Powers offers opinion

James Powers, a Wayne resident, believes his time and good judgement are what he has to offer a member of the board of education.

"I just wanted to get involved. I read an article in the paper, and I felt this is something I could do. The board needs concerned people to do things."

Powers said his concerns include "continuing to educate students. This is very serious. Kids get to college who can't write, read or communicate."

"Quality education is something everyone has a right to expect," he continued. "I didn't always make use of it, but it was there."

Finances are another concern to

Powers. He thinks the board must eye carefully future contracts and that "extra money from the state lottery" should be used to ease the property tax burden now facing residents.

He said he thinks the educational social service center being built by the district is "fantastic" because "a lot of resources are overlooked with our aging people in society. This will do them good and everyone will benefit from the experience and time they can still contribute."

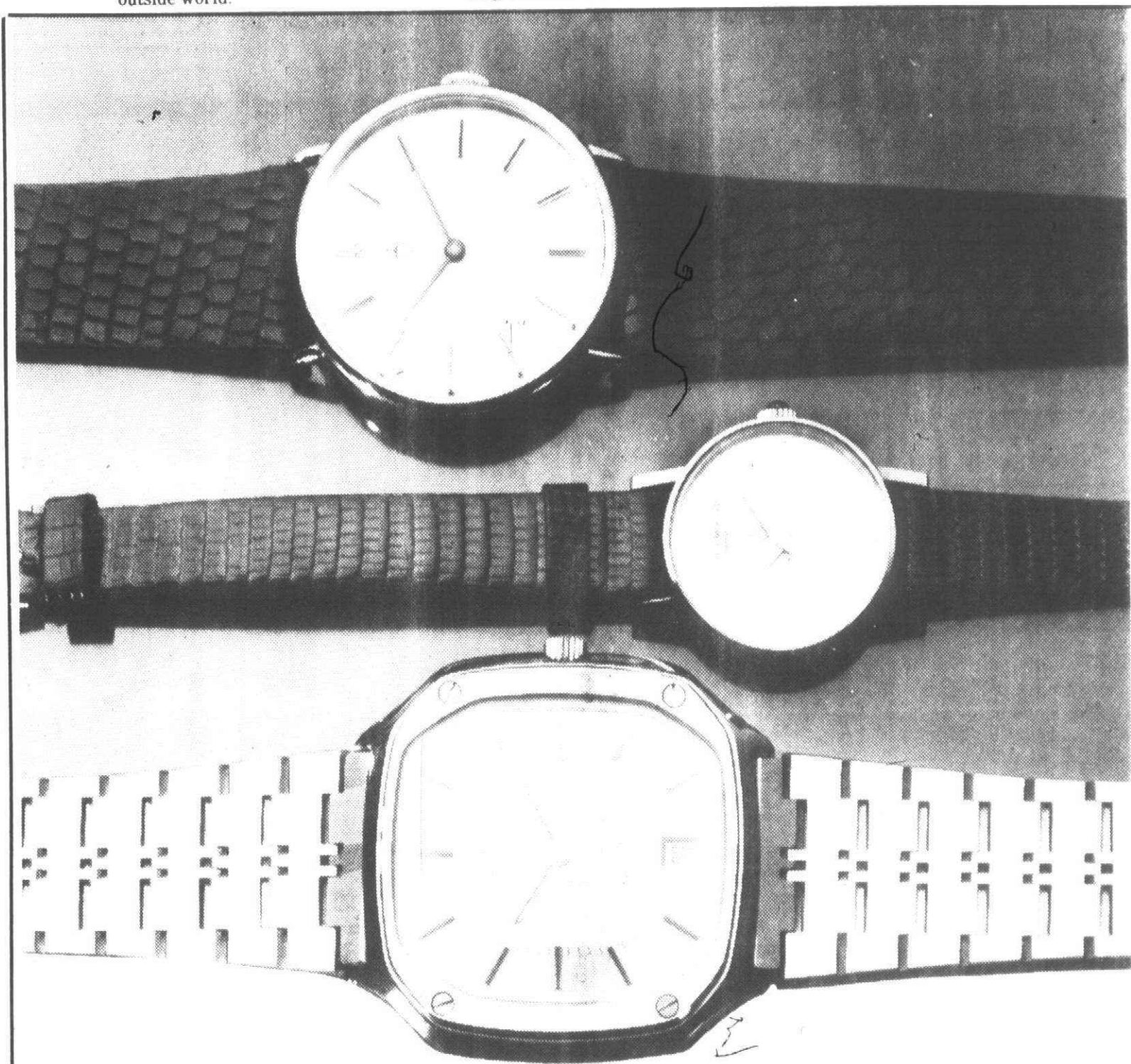
Powers said that instead of circulating literature and seeking contributions and endorsements, he is spreading his campaign by "word-of-mouth."

Then with a voice that denoted optimism of the highest sort, she said, "We already have been promised a plow."

Asked how they planned to set things up when the museum is opened, she confided that they are waiting until the renovation is done before they make any final decisions.

"We have been getting a lot of help from the service clubs, the civic clubs and the township. Now we are waiting for the building to be finished. And that shouldn't be later than next spring."

The wait for the lady who served as president of the historical society for the past three years will soon be over.

Keep open some windows, but stay away from them.

In a mobile home, go to a prearranged substantial shelter. If no shelter exists, lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression and hold onto something on the ground. Always take shelter up wind from the mobile home. Do not remain in the mobile home.

In a vehicle, travel at right angles to the tornado's path. If there is no time to

travel away from it, get out of the vehicle into a basement, ditch or ravine, up wind from the vehicle.

In open country, get into a sturdy building if possible, or lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression and hold onto something on the ground. Make sure you are up wind away from any vehicle or loose material.

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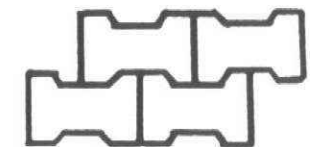


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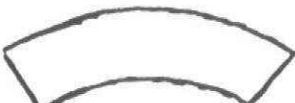
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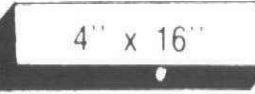
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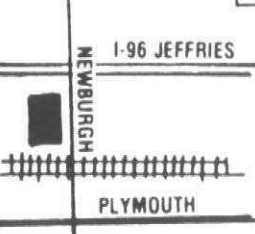
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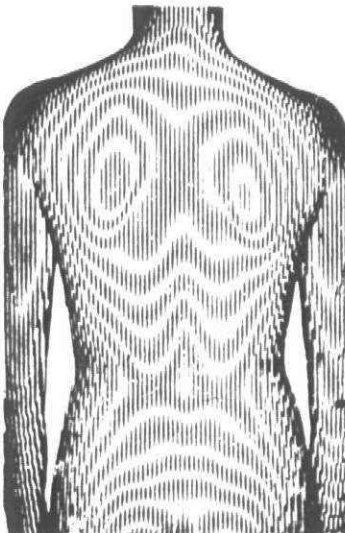
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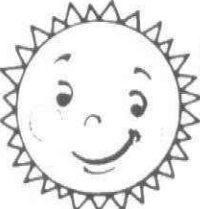
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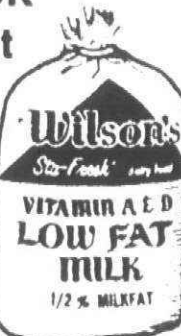
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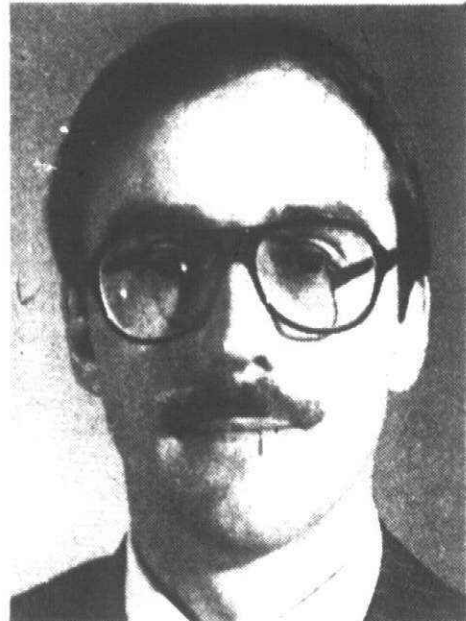
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Law is candidate for re-election

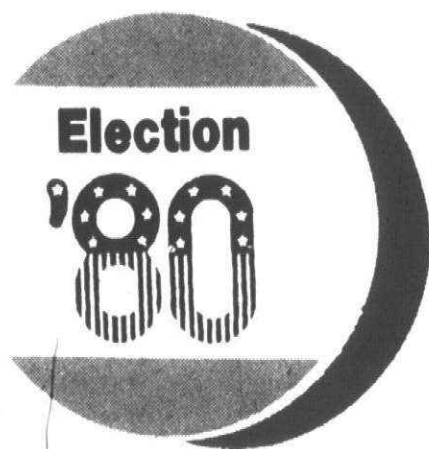
He did so by Monday when he filed for the post in the clerk's office.

Mrs. Hulsing is a past president of the Plymouth Women's Club and spent some 30 years as an executive of the National Girl Scouts Association.

Many races form for charter body

Several current and former suburban local government officials are among the western Wayne County candidates for seats on a proposed charter commission.

Filing deadline was Tuesday for the 27-member charter commission. Candidates have until 6 p.m. Friday to withdraw.

If convening the charter commission is approved by voters Aug. 5, the body will propose county government reforms.

A coalition of suburban local governments has filed suit to block the Aug. 5 charter referendum and nomination of Republican and Democratic candidates for the fall election. The suburban group maintains the apportionment of charter commission districts is unfair

because the 1970 census was used, and there have since been population shifts out of Detroit.

IF THE election isn't blocked in court, the following candidates will be on the Aug. 5 ballot seeking the Democratic or Republican nomination for the charter seats:

• 27th District (City of Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth Townships); Democrats: Jack D. Wiegand of Canton Township, W. Edward Wendover of Plymouth, V. Gregory Holland of Canton, Patrick J. Foley of Canton, Robert L. Myers of Canton, Walter T. Hink of Belleville, Harold Stein of Canton and Gloria E. Hammonds of Canton; Republican: Hagbard J. Berg, Canton.

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Pursell files for 3rd term in House

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, has filed for re-election to a third term in the U.S. House.

Pursell filed for re-election last Friday in the 2nd Congressional District, which covers eastern Washtenaw County, northwestern Wayne County, and nearly all of Monroe County.

The primary cities of the 2nd District are Ann Arbor, Livonia, Ypsilanti, Monroe and Pursell's hometown of Plymouth.

Pursell said his campaign will emphasize his close attention to district constituents, legislative accomplishments in education and other fields, and his elevation to the influential House Appropriations Committee.

"Key issues for the '80s will be inflation control, limits on government, energy, and restoration of a sound economy," said Pursell in announcing his candidacy.

"I've been working on these issues by supporting a balanced budget shared by all departments, proposing a five-year tax cut program, and leadership on development of new sources of energy."

SOME OF PURSELL'S current legislative proposals are his five-year tax

reduction program, alternative energy trust fund, women's bill of rights, preventive medicine act, endangered species education act, and an effort to revitalize physical education in U.S. schools.

A former state senator and county commissioner, Pursell was first elected to Congress in 1976 by a narrow margin. After his first two years in Congress, he was re-elected in 1978 by a margin of more than 50,000 votes, with about 68 percent of the vote.

A major event of Pursell's second term was his successful campaign for a seat on the House Appropriations Committee, one of the most sought-after assignments in Congress.

He also has membership on the appropriations subcommittee, which handles budgets for the departments of education, health and human services, and labor.

Pursell also is ranking minority member on the District of Columbia appropriations subcommittee.

During his first term he served on the education and labor, and science and technology committees.

PURSELL'S EDUCATION accomplishments include:

Writing a new national law on gifted and talented education, shifting emphasis from Washington to local districts; securing improved funding for gifted and talented programs; providing addi-

tional student loan funds; and playing a major role in reversing the Carter Administration effort to eliminate most funding for nursing education.

Pursell also is known as a leader on energy legislation — particularly as an advocate of developing alternative energy sources.

The congressman is one of the few national lawmakers to maintain his family and primary residence in his home district, instead of Washington.

"I return home to the district every week and put primary importance on being available to the people I work for, and the response to this total representation concept has been excellent," said Pursell.

Pursell is an executive board member of the Congressional Environmental Study Conference, a founder and executive board member of the Suburban Caucus, co-chair of the Northeast-Midwest Coalition's Budget Task Force, and member of the Steel Caucus.

Pursell is co-chair, with former U.S. Senator Bob Griffin, of the Congressional Host Committee for next month's GOP National Convention in Detroit.

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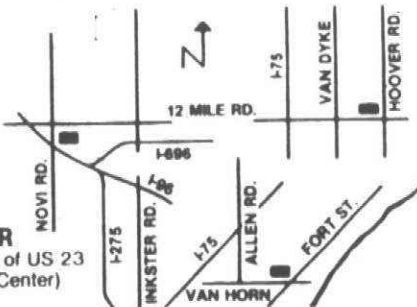
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Senior concert will be staged Friday

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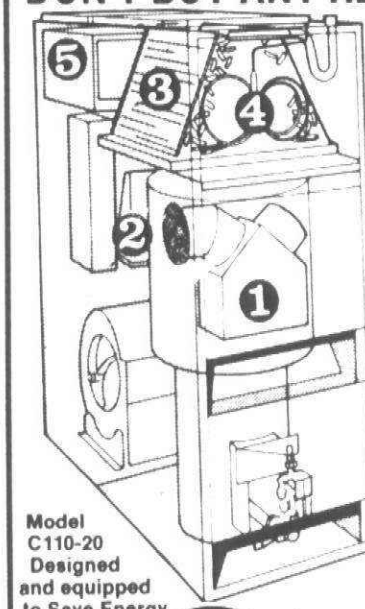

When the camels first appeared in the park a decade ago, the setting was a lot different than today. They were

positioned on the south side of the park and there was a giant monument on the corner of Main Street and Ann Arbor Trail.

After some hard work and pleading the monument finally was moved to Riverside Cemetery and the Wise Men and their mounts had a clear road to the corner.

It was said at the time that the monument was moved in order to prevent the holy band from making a left turn to the Box Bar to quench their thirst.

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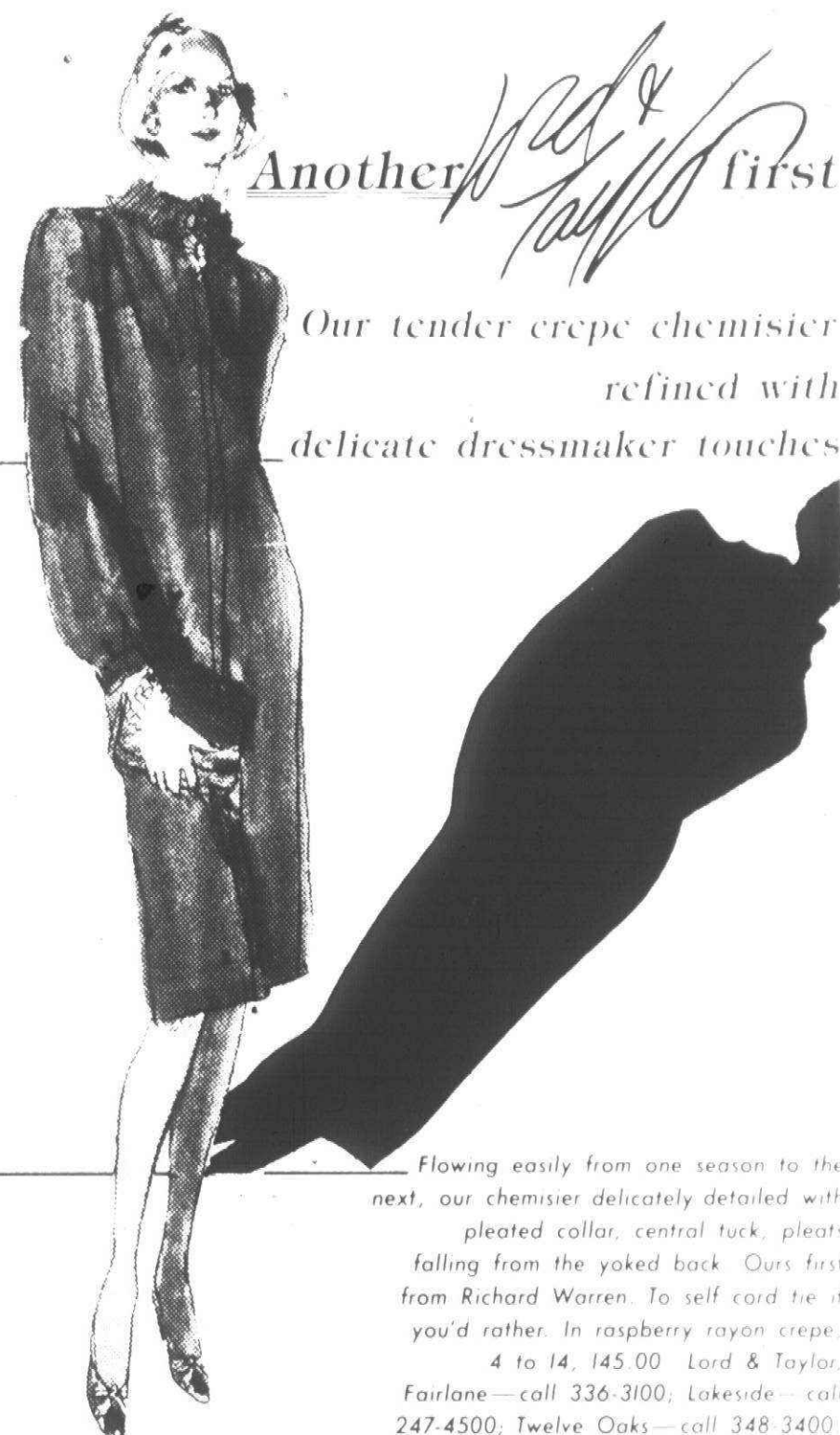
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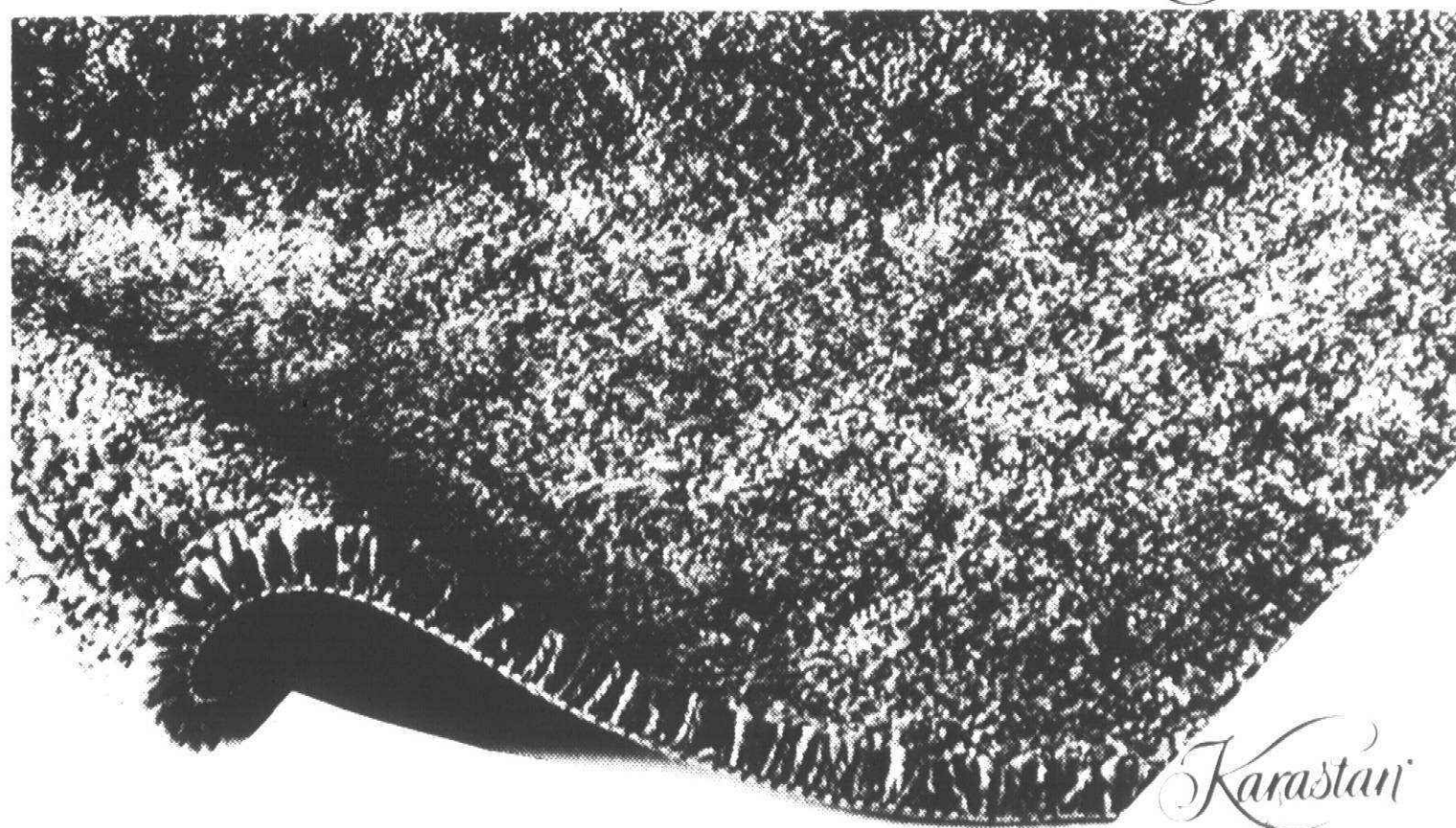

For 1980 the school board needs experience

An important decision which might be overlooked on Monday's school ballot is the selection of who will serve on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Selection of trustees might be overlooked by voters who are primarily concerned with the so-called "money issues" on the ballot.

Yet the trustee election is important as trustees make decisions, week after week, on how money will be spent in the school district.

But more importantly, school trustees decide what return students, parents and residents will receive for money spent.

ON MONDAY'S ballot will appear names of seven residents.

Of those seven, six are actively campaigning for two four-year positions on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The active candidates are incumbents Richard

Arlen and Flossie Tonda and challengers Jim Sinclair, Glenn Schroeder, James Steffen and Dennis Holyoak.

The five trustees who are not up for re-election and will continue to serve are Thomas Yack, Stephen Harper, Elaine Kirchgatter, Carol Davis and Sylvia Stetz.

One asset of the current school board is its balance. There are three males and four females, three Canton residents, three Plymouth Township residents, and one city of Plymouth resident. And there is a good mixture of persons with backgrounds in education, business and finance.

One shortcoming of the board, though, is experience. In recent years there has been a turnover as former trustees have decided not to run again for the office.

As a result, President Yack is the most senior member followed by Tonda (4½ years) and Arlen (4 years). Thus, the second and third most senior

members of the board are up for re-election at the same time.

While seniority and incumbent status should not be automatic tickets for re-election, this year the decision-making process in the school district can best be aided by trying to build an experienced board.

FOR THAT REASON the Observer Newspaper endorses the re-election of Richard Arlen of the city of Plymouth and Flossie Tonda of Canton Township.

The election of Arlen and Tonda not only would build an experienced decision-making team but also would help maintain the balance which now is a strong point.

The Observer does not have any serious problem with either candidate. Although we did not endorse either Tonda or Arlen the first time they ran for the

board, we have watched them perform and can recommend their candidacies to voters.

For residents who feel a change is in order, for whatever reason, the challenger most qualified is Glen Schroeder. The Observer believes Schroeder is well-informed, involved, and concerned about education in the district and recommend his candidacy for those who desire change on the board.

Dennis Holyoak was impressive as a candidate but is very new to the district. He needs to become involved to learn more about the district and its needs. We hope he will because Holyoak could become a viable candidate in a year or two — but not in 1980.

The Observer, therefore, recommends as best qualified Richard Arlen and Flossie Tonda for the board of education. We hope all residents will give serious attention to this very important decision which will have an impact on their pocketbooks for the next four years.

The rollback reversal is like a tax renewal

Proposition I on Monday's ballot is similar to a property tax millage renewal.

A renewal allows a school district to continue levying a specific tax rate for a specified number of years.

Proposition I allows the district to levy a specific rate for one year.

A voter would not be too far wrong in viewing Proposition I as a millage renewal and voting accordingly. The essence is the same.

But technically and legally, Proposal I is not a millage renewal. The proposition is a request to obtain permission from voters to continue levying the authorized millage rate for operation.

In effect, Proposition I asks voters to reapprove the same millage level for operation which now is being collected.

If voters deny this permission, the school district will be required, because of the rollback provisions resulting from the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment, to reduce the operating levy by 1.26 mills.

If Proposition I is approved, the district will continue to levy a total of 35.26 mills for operation. If the proposal is defeated, then the district would levy 34 mills for operation.

If the school district cannot continue levying 35.26 mills, it would lose \$1.05 million (\$1,050,000) in income and would have to cut its expenses by that amount to balance the budget.

THE OBSERVER urges residents to vote "yes" on Proposition I.

The major reason is that the school district still is growing, and more students mean more teachers, buses, books, desks, etc. A growing district just cannot operate on less money.

When Headlee proposed his tax limitation amendment, almost every school district in Michigan was experiencing declining enrollment. But Plymouth-Canton was not and still is not. Headlee did not take growing school districts into account when his committee drafted the tax limitation proposal.

Another reason is that Plymouth-Canton Schools is losing its proportionate share of state aid as the local tax base (total value of property) increases. In fact, for this coming year the school district will receive \$2.1 million less in actual state aid than it receives this year — the first time in the district's history it is experiencing a net actual loss in state aid.

And on top of that net reduction are orders from the governor to cut back state aid payments statewide in an effort to balance the state budget. The district stands to lose \$400,000 from that order.

And so at a time when Plymouth-Canton needs to at least maintain its level of expenditures, the state is severely reducing the amount of state aid payments.

To avoid serious reduction in programs, residents of Plymouth-Canton should at least be willing to pay the same tax rate as was levied this year.

The Observer urges a "yes" vote on Proposition I, because defeat would mean a loss of more than \$1 million in operating funds.

The community is a desirable residential area because of the quality of education. To protect the high residential values, voters should make sure programs don't erode. If that happens, the loss will be far more serious than \$1 million.

Think of tomorrow, as well as today, and vote "yes" on Proposition I on Monday, June 9.



Bond issue keeps faith with what voters want

How much is \$11 million?

It is the amount of money the school district wants to borrow to find classroom space for the students entering the school doors within the next few years.

The figure will buy portable classrooms, buy air conditioners to allow the expansion of Extended School Year (ESY), buy equipment for Lowell Middle School to be rented from Livonia starting 1981-82, and to remodel, renovate and re-equip existing buildings in the district.

That's what the money will buy. The important figure is not \$11 million, but the amount of added tax dollars paid by each taxpayer.

The school district suggests that the bond issue cost is about the same as a double-dip ice cream cone per week. That's one way to look at it.

Another way is the additional dollars in taxes due per year, which varies according to the value of the property of an individual taxpayer.

The owner of a home valued at \$60,000, for instance, would pay \$32.10 more in taxes next year if voters approve the \$11 million loan. For the owner of an \$80,000 home, the added cost next year would be \$42.80, while the owner of a \$100,000 home would pay \$53.50 more in property taxes.

Therefore the important figures concerning Proposition II are those ranging from \$32 to \$53. Those figures are much more manageable to think about than \$11 million.

THE OBSERVER urges a "yes" vote on Proposition II, because it is primarily the same bond issue we supported in March, except it is scaled down.

This bond issue is for \$11 million rather than for

\$14.6 million contained in Proposal I in March. The difference is that the purchase of buses has been eliminated and the planned renovation of Central Middle has been cut in half, from almost \$6.1 million to about \$3.6 million.

The two proposals are philosophically the same. Only the dollar amounts have changed.

The intent of Proposition II on June 9 is to find space for the new students coming without building permanent school buildings. The intent is to meet the needs of today without being stuck with a white elephant tomorrow.

Residents in Plymouth-Canton do not want permanent buildings. That's what voters said last March and that's what they have been saying for some time.

The sister proposal in March almost was approved by voters. The margin of defeat was very slim. The school board is right to give voters another chance to make a clear-cut decision on this issue.

The added students are coming. The cry of the future from youth is, "Ready or not, here we come!" The decision for today is whether classroom space will be found for tomorrow's students. We really cannot decide not to provide the space.

The decision which faces us is what is the most economical way to provide the space? How much can the community afford to provide the needed space? Is the present plan reasonable?

The Observer believes the school board has kept the faith with voters in coming up with a growth solution package which meets the needs without building permanent structures. We now urge voters to keep the faith with the school board by voting "yes" Monday, June 9, on Proposition II.

Voters face 3 excellent choices for 2 W-W seats

Voters in the Wayne-Westland School District can go to the polls Monday, confident that they will be selecting trustees from a fine slate of candidates.

Six candidates are running for two four-year terms on the Board of Education. Incumbent Brian Sullivan of Canton Township dropped out of the race after accepting a job promotion and move to California.

Newcomers on the scene of Wayne-Westland school politics are Glenn Anderson of Westland and James Powers of Wayne. Their appearance in the race continues a tradition of community interest in education.

Both need to become well-seasoned in school operations, however, before they can become effective board members. School officials should keep them in mind for spots on resident-based committees, which convey community concerns.

Candidate Donald Black has been a phantom on the campaign scene. Black has been unable to be reached for comment on his candidacy.

That leaves voters with three prime choices: Mildred Batterson, Mary Arbour and Dave Moranty.

All three are excellent candidates, with the potential to bring expertise to the board.

Incumbent Ms. Batterson, the only woman on the board, is a Wayne resident and a former teacher. Her residency is a plus in her campaign. There are only two other Wayne residents on the seven-member school board giving representation to that community. Arbour and Moranty are both Westland residents.

Ms. Batterson also has her experience and knowledge of school affairs to bolster her in the race. Her attendance at and preparation for board meetings

have been excellent. She knows the issues, asks questions and votes independently.

THE NAME OF Ms. Arbour should be a familiar one to Wayne-Westland residents. Her long standing involvement in education through all levels of the Parent Teacher Association is evidence of her commitment to helping children — a quality valued highly by the Wayne-Westland community.

Ms. Arbour has the ability to synthesize all components of education. She also understands the legislation required for educational changes and what the role of a board member is.

WITH AN EQUALLY impressive history of involvement in school affairs is Moranty. His strong suit is in the area of finances, and he has already spent long hours comprehending the district's precarious financial situation. He has been a familiar figure at past board meetings, asking questions and probing for information.

Moranty also promises to develop better lines of communication between school officials and the rest of the community. That will be important for all board members to keep in mind as they face the problems of declining enrollment and financing for education.

BATTERSON, ARBOUR AND MORANTY — three top candidates for two jobs present a happy dilemma for district voters. The choice is up to you, but the most important thing is that voters exercise that right to choose.

Tough decisions face future board members. Voters must assure themselves that at least they have chosen the people to make those decisions that will affect the future of their children.



Lights, camera, action, Farmington

TV viewers in western Europe and Africa will get a 30-second look at a nearby park when Kelvinator International distributes its newest refrigerator commercial.

Here's the scenario: It takes place in Farmington City Park — a sleepy enough site. Suddenly, a kids' soccer team kicks up a storm, then beelines it to three refrigerators stocked with food — yes, right there in the park — and they gorge themselves on ice cream, pop and apples.

The premise is that kids are food experts who spend more time with refrigerators than just about anybody.

The spot will be dubbed in English, French and Spanish. Viewers will see the park and a long distance shot of a new senior citizen housing development across the street.

"We were looking for a location that would be non-descript," said Georgette Smart, who scouted the location.

"Farmington, with the building in the background in one shot, looks European. Also it's a nice park and the people of Farmington were very cooperative."

Ms. Smart, president of Cinema Plus Inc. of Southfield, wrote, directed and produced the commercial. She drafted a real Southfield soccer team of 10- to 12-year-olds for the part.

"USING CHILDREN, soccer and food are concepts everyone can relate to," she said.

"The final product is beautiful. Our client is extremely happy."

Farmington's city manager, Robert Deadman, is also happy.

"I think it's very nice," he said. "It's always nice to get favorable publicity."

"The park is a pretty setting with a stream and woody setting behind it."

Deadman said Farmington was chosen because "it's the best town in the whole U.S.A.," then he admitted that it was also conveniently located for the Southfield-based production crew.

The city manager didn't watch any of the filming which ran from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. one day last month.

Larry Karlo, Kelvinator's ad agency representative in Ceresco, near Battle Creek, said the agency will be made available to Kelvinator distributors in several countries.

"Kids and soccer are a winning combination because of their international popularity," he said.

While the kids-turned-actors were treated to hamburgers after the filming, the three refrigerators loaded with chicken, fruit, vegetables and cheese were hauled to Producers Color Service Inc. in Detroit where a second commercial was filmed.

That one featured a lion "shrunk" by a photographic technique and put into one of Kelvinator's Leonard line refrigerators.

- Free canoeing guides and maps of the Huron Clinton Metropolitan Authority are available by writing HCMA at 3050 Penobscot Building, Detroit, 48226. A large self-addressed stamped return envelope with 20 cents postage is required.

- Some easily accessible places to canoe in the area are the Huron River near Proud Lake, Kensington Lake and Lower Huron Metropolitan Park. Newburgh Lake is also a good place to learn. Consult the HCMA guide for launching sites and liveries.

- Many canoe rental sites are listed in the Yellow Pages of the telephone book. Call ahead or write in advance to get the proper type of canoe for your outing and the best possible rental price.

New club members wanted

Canoe novices can learn basics

If you own a canoe and haven't used it much, or if you want to try canoeing but don't know how to get started, Bill Labbe is a man to see.

Labbe's dream is to start a canoeing club to teach novices the basics of the sport and an appreciation of the outdoors.

"As I drive around, I see a lot of canoes in back yards, but not many people using them," he said. "A canoe is probably the most versatile, useful watercraft available."

"A lot of people who get a canoe find out they can't handle it very well. Most people need to know how to paddle a canoe straight and how to turn — basic technical strokes," said Labbe.

"Before you ever get in a canoe, you should know how to swim and how to right it (the canoe). You should not be in a canoe without a personal flotation device."

"There are proper ways to launch a canoe."

"I would like to see more people learn properly because then their interest level would stay higher."

Labbe said he doesn't want to dictate what the canoeing club will accomplish. He does have some ideas, though.

"I'd like to have lessons in technique and safety and equipment. I would like to see outings on a regular basis, weekly or semi-weekly."

"I'd like to see canoeing advanced into the schools — canoeing and safety competition and flat-water racing."

Labbe, 40, has been canoeing since he was nine years old.

"I started fishing in a canoe and became so interested in canoeing, fishing became secondary."

Labbe is convinced there is a need for a club.

There is a difference, he believes, between sport canoeists and people who go out in gangs a couple of times a year to party on a stream or lake.

"I call those people livery turkeys," said Labbe. "Those are people who never own a canoe and do it once a year. They're not interested in canoeing."

"They picnic on the river and fall in to cool off. They create an awful lot of pressure on the river."

"A problem is that the liveries (canoe rentals) encourage that kind of business. They depend on groups to make an annual tour."

"Let's face it. When you have any business, you want it to grow and make money. You encourage that kind of trade that grows fast (large, partying groups)."

"I think a canoe club has the opportunity to take younger people and encourage canoeing as a sport, not as a party weekend. As younger people become more familiar with a canoe as a recreational vehicle, they have more respect for it."

Labbe is also aware of the occasional conflict between canoeists and fishermen on popular rivers, most notably, the Au Sable.

"I like the approach the DNR (Department of Natural Resources) has," Labbe said. "I feel you can canoe during the day and fishermen can have the river in the morning and evening when fishing is best anyhow."

As an individual becomes proficient with a canoe, he should begin to notice and appreciate more the ecology of a river or lake system.

"People who canoe are very ecological-minded, especially if they want to go back to an area and use it again. You spoil your own sport if you're not responsible. When you see pollution from a canoe, it really impacts on you."

The progression from learning the basics of operating a canoe to conservation runs full circle with political awareness and activism.

Public access to lakes and rivers is becoming more limited. Permits limiting canoe access are already in effect on some rivers such as the Pine near Cadillac.

Then, there is the conflict between fishermen and canoeists that really hasn't been resolved.

Other big issues that occasionally crop up are government plans to modify wild rivers through the Army Corps of Engineers and oil-drilling in river basins.

Labbe hopes to touch on political issues which relate to both canoeing and conservation if enough interest is shown to start a club.

"The more organized you are, the better say you have."

Salem quartet lowers 440 time

When a trackman gets to the state final level of competition, he shouldn't really be disappointed if he doesn't place among the top six and win a medal.

The field was strong again last weekend at the Class A meet in Grand Rapids. And only two area athletes who attended earned state recognition.

Andy Dillon, a senior from Detroit Catholic Central was the highest finisher. He placed third in the two-mile run with a clocking of 9:19.0.

Charlie Martin, from Livonia Steven-

son, won the sixth-place medal in discus with a throw of 158.2.

Several other good performances were recorded.

David Hall, from Stevenson, timed 14.5 in the 120-yard hurdles, 38.5 in the 330 hurdles and cleared 6-3 in high jump, but did not place in any of the events.

The Spartans' 880-yard relay team of Kevin Gallagher, Jim Recker, Rich Dubois and Hall clocked 1:30.02, just missing sixth place by a fraction of a second.

Stevenson's Joe Jacobites ran 2:04 in the open 880 and did not place.

PLYMOUTH SALEM'S 440-yard relay team of Greg Lipka, Bob Pittaway, Jim Spooner and Leigh Langkabel had its best time of the spring, 44.2, but did not place. The quartet just missed setting a new school record.

Pittaway also hurled the discus 150-8, but again, did not place.

Grant Gorton, Livonia Franklin's only state qualifier, cleared 13-3 in

pole vault, but did not crack into the group consisting of the best six.

Paul Bialowicz long jumped 20-3. John Murzin put the shot 50-3 and Brendan McCarthy cleared 12-9, opening height in the pole vault, but none placed. All three represented Redford Bishop Borgess.

Rich Easton and Darrel Copley, both from Livonia Churchill, also failed in their bids for medals. Copley's best effort in the shot put was 47-4, Easton's best in pole vault was 12-9.

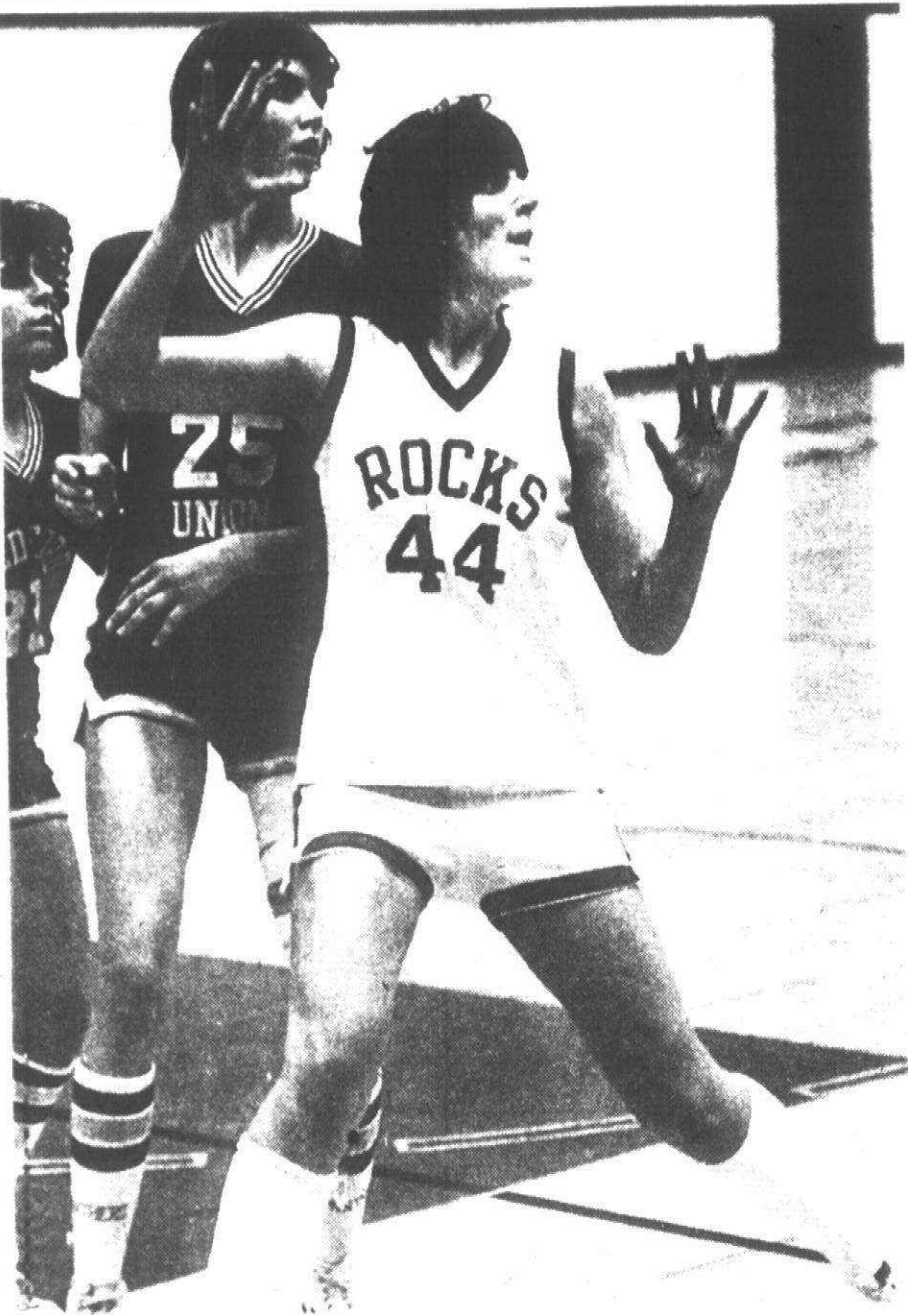

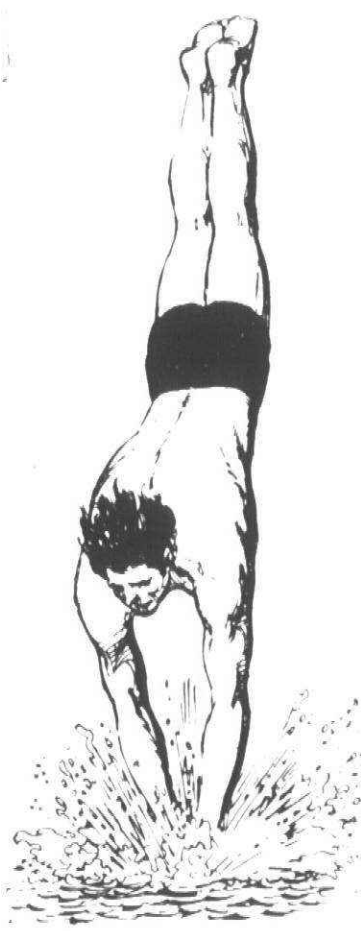

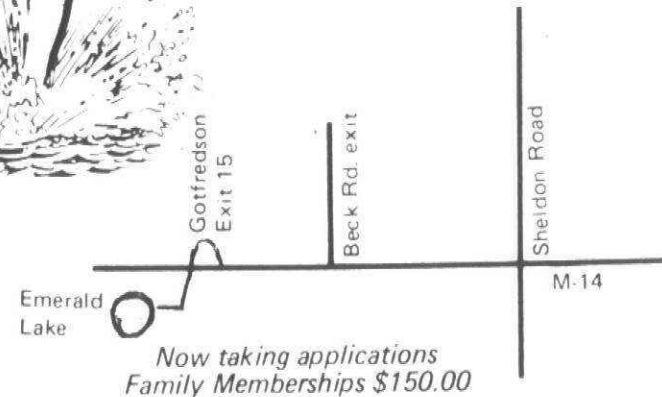

It's an old-fashioned, family-style event open to the public at Greenmead, Livonia's 103-acre historical site on Eight Mile, west of Newburgh Road. Proceeds are earmarked for the restoration of the last remaining Detroit United Railway (DUR) waiting room located in the historical village portion of Greenmead.

Special attractions this year will be an area of old-fashioned children's games to entertain the small fry between the ages of 3 and 13. There'll be apple bobbing, pie-eating contests, penny scatter, nail driving, arm wrestling, balloon whisking and a bubblegum blowing contest — to mention a few.

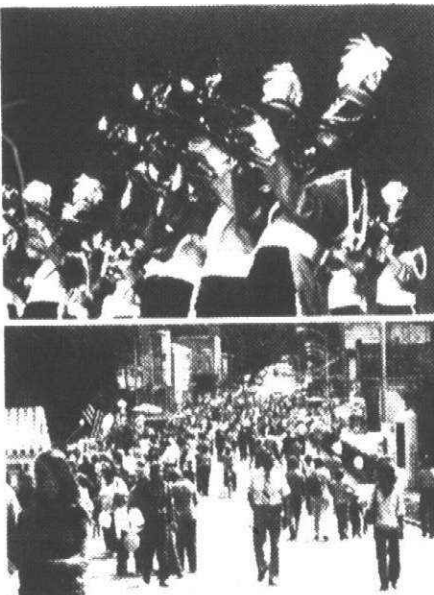

The Michigan theme of the sorority is "Tomorrow Begins today." Major project of the state group is a large contribution to the Kidney Foundation each year.

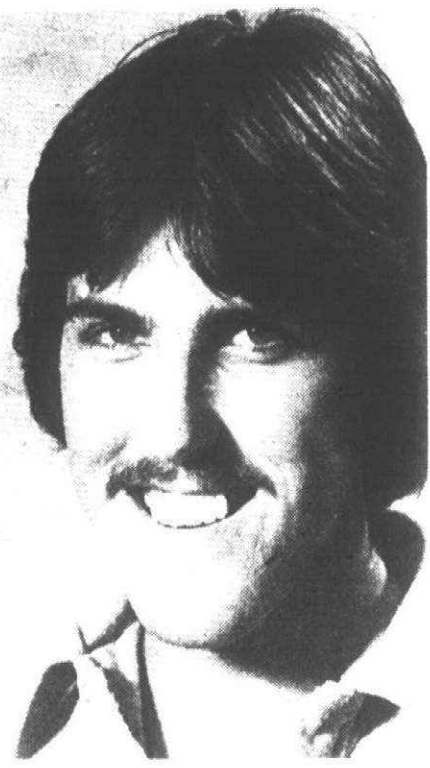

RITTER, leaving Newburg after leading his church to a large membership growth and in the building of two major additions, also has been involved in Livonia community activities.

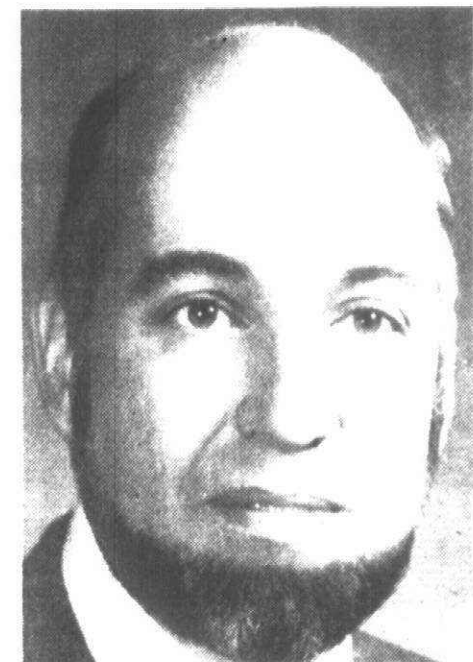

Astral projection: it's one way to go

Dear Gundella:

A couple of years ago you wrote about astral projection (out-of-body travel), and how a person could learn to practice it. Do you know if anyone has ever tried to achieve and control this through hypnosis?

T.R., Livonia

Dear T.R.:

In his book, "Man Outside Himself," published in 1969 by University Books, Inc. of New York, H.F. Battersby describes such experiments in detail. During these experiments, many of which were remarkably successful, the hypnotist would direct his subject to release himself from his body and to travel to a particular location.

Then he would question the subject, whose body remained at rest in the chair and fully able to engage in conversation with the hypnotist, about what was happening at exactly that moment in the place to which he was astrally projected.

Later investigation would reveal that, time and time again, the reports given by the subject under hypnosis were accurate in every detail.

IN 1975, an associate and I were teaching a class in astral projection in Sarasota. We did not use hypnosis in the strictest sense of the term, but we did give our students suggestions while they were in a self-induced state of altered consciousness.

We directed them to "visit" a classroom here in Michigan and to describe it in detail. The classroom in question was one with which we were very familiar, since we held evening classes there when we were at home.

Eight of the 15 students in the class gave precise and accurate descriptions of the room, even to the color of the carpet and the pictures on the wall. However, one thing troubled us.

Every one of these eight students mentioned an animal cage and a rabbit or hamster in the corner to the right of the door. We knew of no such cage or animal.

When we returned home, we learned that the teacher who used the classroom in the daytime had purchased a guinea pig in our absence. The cage was placed just to the right as one entered the room.

SOMETIMES PEOPLE travel in their sleep without even trying to. In another class, held in Westland, I had a very good student named Elaine who never missed a class. Then one night, as I was taking roll, she did not answer.

Several others in the class remarked that they had seen her in the hall just before class. One woman pointed out that Elaine had not looked very well when she saw her. The others agreed and remarked that although Elaine was usually a very well-groomed woman, that night she was wearing a very wrinkled purple pantsuit and no makeup at all and her hair was uncombed.

Thus, we assumed she was ill and had returned home.

The next week, however, Elaine appeared in class as well-groomed and alert as ever, apologizing for missing class the week before.

She explained that her children both had the flu and she was exhausted from caring for them, so she had lain down, fully dressed, and had fallen asleep, thinking about the class but too tired to attend.

When asked what she was wearing at the time, she replied, "An old purple pantsuit. Why?"

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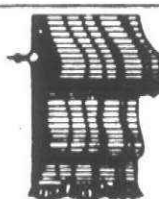


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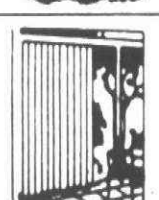
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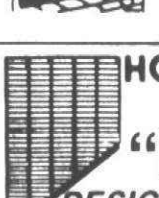
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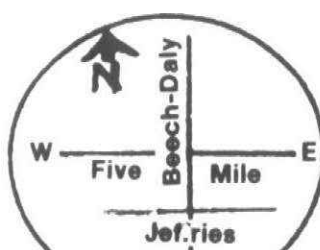
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Auditions set for wind ensemble

When Irving Sarin's father spent \$15 in precious depression money to buy his son a trumpet, he couldn't have known how much he would get for his money.

Sarin went on to study at the New England Conservatory, the Boston Conservatory, Juilliard and Michigan State University. At Juilliard and the Berkshire Symphonic Festival, he received full scholarships.

Sarin, who has played with leading symphonies around the world, is now forming a symphonic wind ensemble for exceptionally gifted students of high school age.

Called the Sarin Symphonic Wind Ensemble of

Southfield, the non-profit group is being organized by parents of present and former students of Sarin, a resident of Livonia.

The ensemble is being sponsored by the city of Southfield Cultural Arts Department and the Southfield Public Schools.

Membership in the ensemble will be determined by audition with Sarin, renowned as a musician, college orchestra and ensemble conductor and trumpet teacher.

Sarin's experience includes being principal trumpeter with the Israel Philharmonic, the Pittsburgh, and Boston Pops Orchestras, among others.

AUDITION appointments may be scheduled by calling 354-4717. Students should have had prior training and experience. Younger musicians may audition upon recommendation of their private instructor, Mrs. Geltner said.

The ensemble will present at least four concerts in the coming school year featuring guest artists of national stature.

Sarin also plans to develop woodwind quintets, quartets, brass choirs, and other smaller groups from the ensemble.

Rehearsals are scheduled for Saturday mornings, starting in September.

A token tuition fee of \$35 a semester will be charged, said Mrs. Geltner, to help defray expenses, although the fee may be waived if there is financial need.

"We also hope to establish merit scholarships," she said.

As conductor of the ensemble, Sarin brings to the group an extensive playing and teaching career with such conductors as Antal Dorati, Leonard Bernstein, Eugene Ormandy, Paul Paray, Sir Thomas Beecham, Otto Klemperer and Leopold Stowokski.

He also recorded more than 60 albums for leading record companies.

ONE RECORDING is the movie score of "Age of Steel" written and conducted by Dimitri Tiomkin.

Among his students were Paul Randall, with the New Orleans Symphony, Tim Sheibels with a symphonic orchestra in Germany, both of Livonia, Adrian Maxwell of the Halifax Symphony and Jim Stubbs, with the American Symphony of Kansas.



HE HAS been a private teacher and conductor since 1968 at Wichita State, Duquesne and Michigan State Universities and conducted the University of Wichita Brass and Percussion Ensemble at the Music Educators National Conference in St. Louis.

Married to Anne, a former concert pianist and guitarist, they are parents of four non-musicians: Elizabeth, 21, Jennifer, 18, Charles, 17, and Edward, 12.

Auditions for the new ensemble are scheduled for June 7 and 8 at the Southfield Parks and Recreation Building in the Civic Center, 26000 Evergreen.

They will consist of a five-minute maximum solo performance of classical music and sight reading, said Sarin.

"We encourage all the young wind instrumentalists looking for an intensive performance experience, and striving for professional excellence to audition for the ensemble," said Beverly Geltner, chairwoman of the new group.

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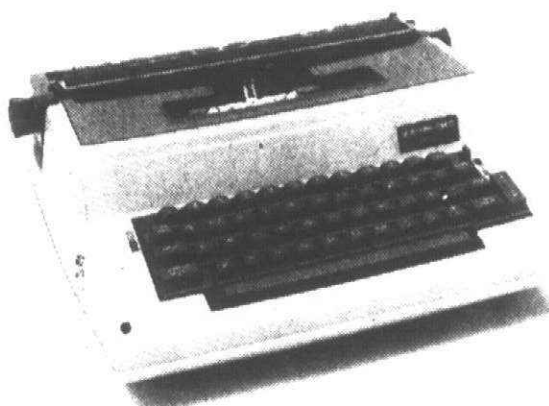
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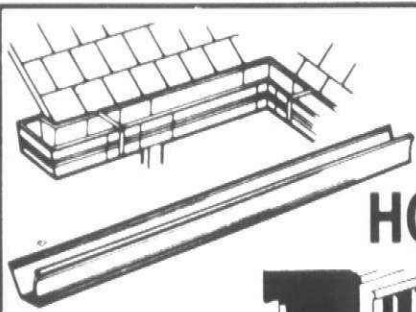
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Model has what it takes, and takes and takes

This year I'm into baseball — between the innings. If you watch the Delta Dental commercial very closely and don't blink, you'll see me shaking hands with a gentleman among a group of people about to be photographed. The incredible fact is that it took over 70 takes plus rehearsals to make that brief commercial.

I arrived on the set of the Highland Park studio promptly at 9:15 a.m. to begin what Affiliated Models had promised to be "an all-day, assignment" and closed the door behind me on a beautiful sunny day. Even our lunch break was spent in the windowless studio. Yet we did have brief reminders of the sun as the heat from the set lights defied solar energy and kept the makeup artist occupied powdering perspiration from everyone's brow.

By the time I opened the door again at 6:30 p.m., the sun had tired of waiting.

I GREW UP in this atmosphere. My parents felt any 2-year-old capable of walking should be able to earn a living. So shortly after my second birthday, they walked me into the Jam Handy Organization on West Grand Blvd. where I began an enjoyable career in commercial motion pictures, slide films, as well as magazine advertisements and eventually radio and television.

My mother wasn't a "stage mother." Mom's rule was: "If you want to do it,

then handle it yourself. Otherwise — stay home."

Once she helped me learn my lines, I wouldn't see her until wardrobe changes. Generally, she was off in a corner trying to catch up on the rest she had lost the night before while she had prepared my clothing, washed and ironed and finally packed the suitcases.

MAKING THE DELTA commercial was routine compared to some of the humorous situations I remember encountering as a child. Like the commercial film made for a floor model freezer that advertised "So convenient even a child can use it."

This script cue called for me to: walk up to the freezer, open the lid, reach in and take out a cake. Simple!

The director shouted, "Camera! Action!"

I walked to the freezer, opened the lid, r-e-a-c-h-e-d for the cake sitting on the bottom of the freezer and — fell into the freezer — head first.

"CUT!" yelled the director.

Another time, Buick wanted to demonstrate how easily the front door could be opened. Not being a muscle-bound 10-year-old, when the script called for me to run up to the door and fling it open, I struggled every time.

The director solved the problem. Without bothering to tell me, the genius hid a stagehand on the floor of the car who could open the door from the inside without being seen.

"Action!" resounded the director.

I ran to the car. Magically I opened the door. As I went to jump into the front seat, I saw this body lying there and screamed.

"CUT!" yelled the director.

DO MY CHILDREN model? Never. While I enjoyed a professional child-

hood, I'm too familiar with the sacrifices involved. I want my children to play without fear of skinning a knee and losing a job the next day. I never want them to have to worry over how they are going to make up the school work they missed while on a two-week movie assignment.

Children are meant to be loved for who they are, not judged for what they are. There is no such thing as an ugly

child. Every child is an uniquely beautiful masterpiece. If you can't find the beauty at first glance, look into their eyes. Like a pearl hidden within the oyster's shell, you can't mistake the treasure.

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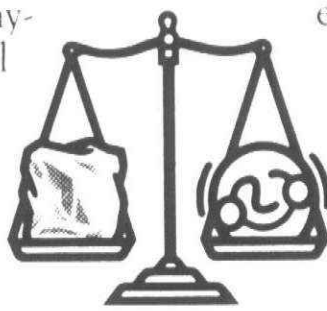
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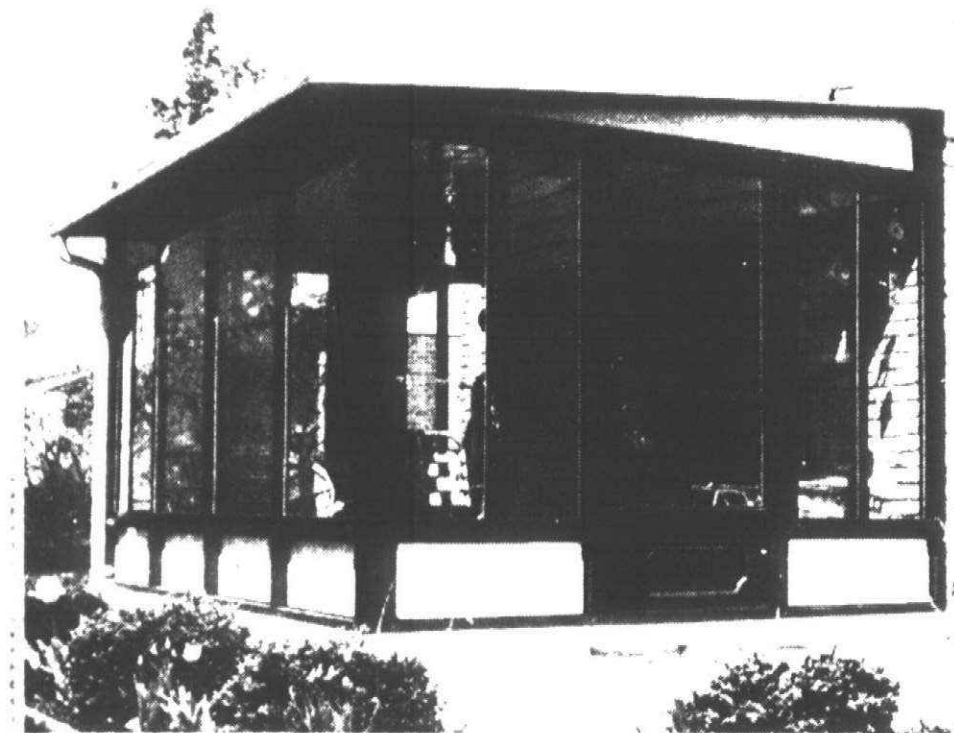
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'Joy of Gardening' theme of annual luncheon meeting

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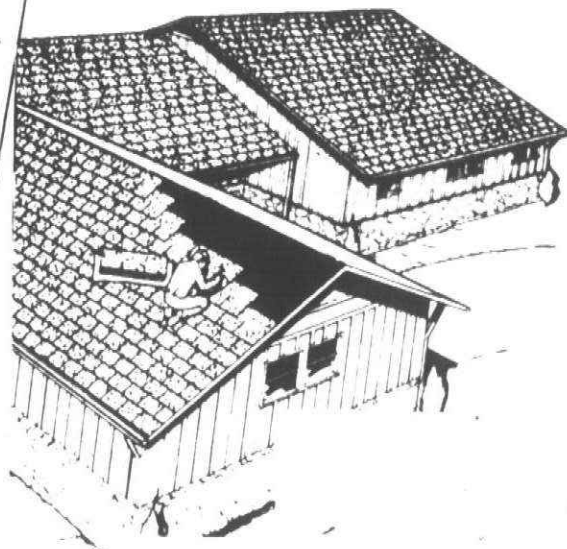

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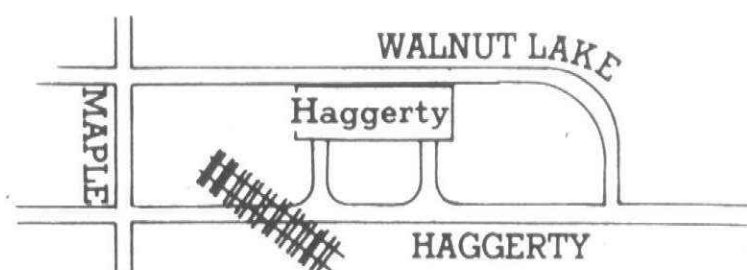

Montreux

Behind the festival is a jet-setting lover of jazz

For seven summers, Livonian Don Lupp has been taking his love of jazz to one of today's great fountains of the art — the Montreux International Jazz Festival in Switzerland.

This year, the head of Henry Ford Community College's music department will again head a jazz studies program at Montreux, an arts loving community that faces Geneva down a long lake.

But before the summer is over, Lupp will have played an important role in turning the tables and bringing Montreux to Detroit for the first Montreux-Detroit International Jazz Festival scheduled over the Labor Day weekend.

The story of the first Montreux festival in this country and the motor city's hosting one of the world's most prestigious jazz events goes back to 1972 and involves a lot of people on both sides of the Atlantic.

For Don Lupp, you might say it began with a 1972 conversation between a Swiss consulate who happens to be a jazz buff and a Swiss airlines official.

Or you might go back farther, to his early years of growing up as a student of wind instruments and an admirer of jazz greats like Bennie Goodman and Johnny Hodges.

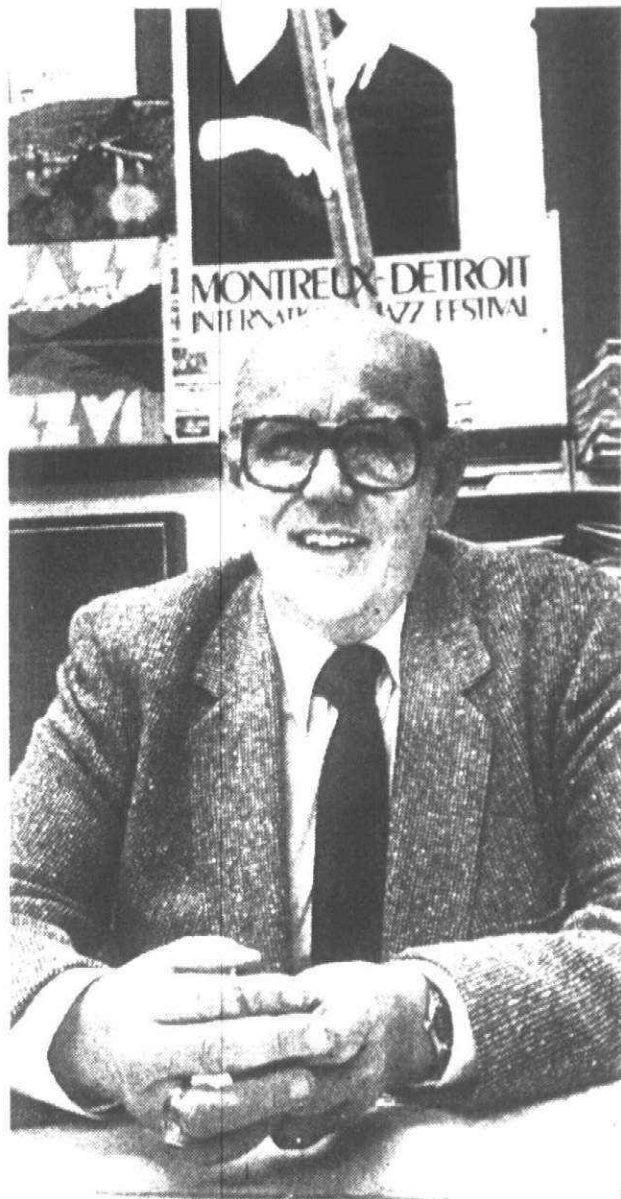
BECAUSE OF his long interest in jazz, he listened attentively when he heard from the airlines man that the Swiss consul thought it strange that people in this country didn't know about the famed Montreux festival.

Lupp certainly knew about the festival, a meeting of the best in bands that began during the 1960s as a weekend competition for the right to represent Europe at the classic Newport Jazz Festival. By the time he talked to the airlines man, it had become a big event in its own right.

"He wanted me to go for a package deal to take some students to the festival," Lupp said. "I wasn't interested in that."

But eventually the music teacher did put together a summer studies package for college students, and he took it to Montreux where he met with Michael Ferla, director of the festival, and Raymond Jaussi, a leading citizen of the Swiss city.

"I included in the program courses in English and ecology, because music seems to be always at the low end of the totem pole," said Lupp. "But as it turned out, the jazz studies program was the only part that survived."

JAZZ STUDIES have been going on at Montreux every summer since 1972, with bands from colleges around the country auditioning by sending tapes to Lupp at Henry Ford Community College.

Then they head for the Swiss city each July, working in jobs like chaffering the visiting bands and setting up for them and getting in some studies as well as the opportunity to hear some of the

When Josh White wakes up, he might be home

As a popular entertainer and performer on stages the world over, Josh White Jr. has spent 35 of his 39 years traveling.

These days are no exception. He is frequently gone from his Rosedale Park home in Detroit to do a college concert in the Midwest or a nightclub date on the East Coast or a concert in the South.

At 11 a.m. one recent morning, he was still in bed. He had just returned from a club in Chicago and was due to leave in a day for a weekend in Wisconsin.

"Is this Wednesday?" his wife Sarah asked with an amused smile. "We forgot about you coming today."

While White struggled to wake up and throw some Levi's on, Sarah made a pot of tea and chatted about their teenage children. A sleepy Josh White Jr. barefooted his way downstairs, yawning, and curled up on the couch.

WHITE HAS two weeks to enjoy his family of six children. He is staying in town long enough to do a two-week engagement at the Raven Gallery, his favorite local hangout. Despite a schedule that has him touring through much of the year, he always schedules three or four appearances there.

"It's nice to be associated with one place," White said. "Since 1963, it's been the Raven for me around here. Staying with one club is good because people always know where to find you."

His last album "Sing a Rainbow" was recorded live at the Raven Gallery. Previously, he recorded four albums, in a career that has seen success for him as a singer, guitar player, Broadway actor and TV performer.

Growing up in New York with his legendary father, also a singer and guitar player, Josh White Jr. was performing on the stage by age 4 and was a child actor on Broadway soon thereafter.

His first recording was a 45 for Decca when he was 16 years old. On one side of that record was a song called "See

Saw" written by his 12-year-old friend and schoolmate, Marvin Hamlisch.

"I went to a private school in New York called Professional Children's School," he said. "There were a lot of budding actors and actresses who went there. On the bulletin board in the school there were always calls."

"It was just understood that if there was a part you wanted to audition for, you just signed out and went to it. Then, if you got it and went out on the road, you took a correspondence course to keep up with your studies."

IT HAS BEEN 20 years since Josh White Jr. has done any acting. But between 1949 and 1960 he appeared in five Broadway plays, one off-Broadway play and more than 50 television dramas. The parts for black children and adolescents dropped off around 1960.

"I was always singing," White said, "so when no acting jobs came along, I just kept singing."

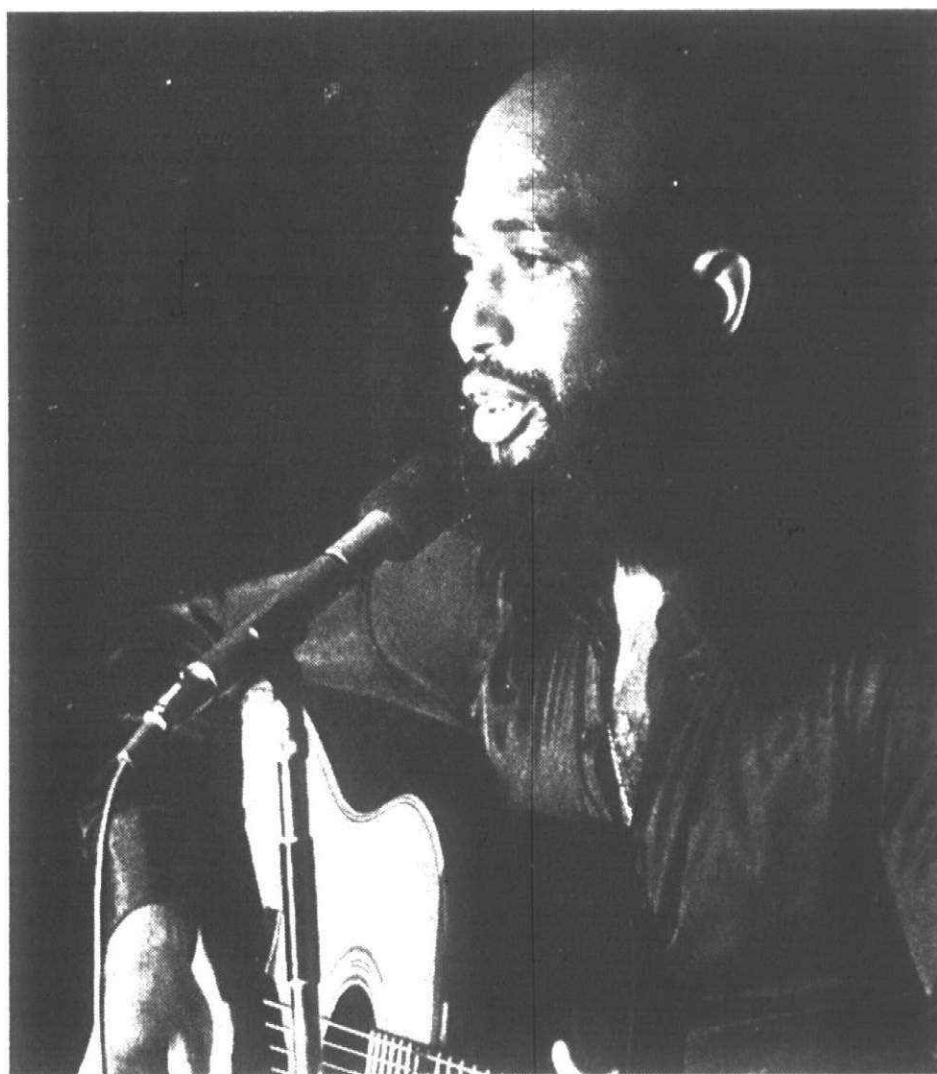
"I wasn't that serious about acting, anyway — at least not enough to give up singing."

Because he began touring and recording with his father, as a small child, traveling has been a way of life for him. His wife finds his frequent trips sometimes difficult to cope with.

"My casual attitude about leaving my family doesn't help Sarah," White said as he began to wake up.

"My two boys have grown up on the road, but I think it has helped them in some ways. They've learned you can go anywhere and make friends and not have to have close proximity to maintain friendships."

"They have solid friends that they see maybe only once or twice a year."

His oldest son, now 16, is the first family member in three generations to have a normal adolescence, White said. Neither of his two sons seems interested in singing or following in his or their grandfather's footsteps.

"Unlike me and my father," White said happily, "they can sit back and enjoy growing up."

AS A YOUNGSTER doing a concert on stage with his father, White would sing three or four songs of his own but would let his father do the entertaining.

"When I began to perform as a single, I would return to those songs I used to do with my father."

"Once I saw a black performer in Boston and I watched him simply talk to his audience about anything that happened in his life."

"His delivery was good, and people related to that. I decided then that that was entertaining and have used that approach when I perform."

His music, he said, reflects his own philosophies of life.

"Over the years, I looked around and realized how important music is in people's lives. Mary Travers has said that music is the echo in a person's life. I believe that."

"I never did a lot of blues, not like my father did. I guess the blues never sounded believable the way I did them."

"I have to believe what I sing and not sing a song just because it is popular."

"As I get older, I take more of me on stage. It's harder to separate me from my performance."

"I can't stand to sing songs that aren't positive. I have a certain feeling that I'm throwing out that I want people to pick up."

"THERE ARE too many songs about cheating or that say,

"I don't know what I'm going to do with my life if you leave me." That's crazy. People need to hear in song that their life will be perpetuated."

White paused here and looked out his living room window, searching for what he would say next.

"It's very important to stay positive. I know it sounds funny to use the word spiritual, but that's how I feel about this." He pressed his lips together to emphasize what he was saying.

"If I don't think things are getting better in this world, then I don't have much hope. I like to think that I can help make things better through my songs."

Not surprisingly, Josh White Jr. communicates his feelings about life whenever he performs. It's at the Raven Gallery where he seems to be most at home and comfortable, and the audience leaves singing a rainbow song, just the way they have learned from him.

world's best jazz. Lupp is on hand each summer to direct the program. This summer the dates are July 4-20.

"As a musician in a two-year college I was especially interested in setting up this kind of program," he said. "There is the opportunity to have a jazz program in a two-year college which in other ways cannot compete with four-year music programs."

This year, while noting with some satisfaction that Wayne State University is just beginning to offer a degree in jazz study, Lupp is turning a lot of attention to the development that will put the eyes of the musical world on Detroit.

From Aug. 28 through Sept. 1, top jazz musicians from all over will converge on the motor city, putting on a myriad of concerts on the riverfront, in Hart Plaza and in Music Hall.

The announcement of the first North American edition of the Montreux festival was made early this year by Detroit Mayor Coleman Young with Jaussi, Ferla and Robert McCabe, president of the Detroit Renaissance Foundation, joining him at historic Music Hall.

The festival will be sponsored by the Renaissance Foundation in cooperation with the Detroit Plaza Hotel, Music Hall Center for the Performing Arts and the Detroit Council for the Arts.

WHILE PLANS for the weekend of stellar performances involve renowned professional musicians from all over the country and local stars on the jazz scene, Lupp's main involvement will be

with student musicians when he comes home from Montreux in Switzerland to Montreux Detroit.

So far he has acceptances from a long list of college and university bands, University of Michigan, Michigan State, Wayne State, Purdue, Aquinas, Mott Community College in Flint, Washtenaw Community College and, of course, his own Henry Ford Community College.

Some top high school aggregations are being invited, bands like Northwestern High's Jazz Ensemble led by Ernie Rogers.

And Lupp is working on schemes to get some star groups from other parts of the country here for the festival.

"The problem is transportation for schools like North Texas State, which is the first university in the country to start a jazz program," Lupp said.

"But I'd like to get that band here and also the ones from Miami University and Humbert College of Toronto. I'm trying to find out if there is someone who will pick up the airline tab."

Participating groups will make two appearances each in varying areas. HFCC's representative will be one of those playing for Big Band night on Sunday. Tickets and schedules will be available in record and music stores.

LUPP, WHO began his university work in engineering, switched to music and taught in Dearborn schools before joining the community college staff.

Music and engineering go well together, he said, adding that he builds a lot of his musical equipment.

"They shouldn't pass it by, because some of the derby's best prizes are for the kids who look most like Tom and Becky," says Eleanor Chruscial, chief adviser to contest chairman Hank Chruscial.

The fishing derby will run from 7 a.m. to noon with the Tom and Becky look-alike contest starting during the fish weigh-in.

You can enter either the fishing contest, the costume contest or both. Most kids enter both.

It's best to start with Mark Twain's novel "Tom Sawyer" for ideas. Mrs. Chruscial heaves a sigh as she confesses that each year the winners are getting harder and harder to judge.

"The fish judges have it easy — they just measure and weigh fish. In the Tom and Becky contest, you really have to think," she said.

The best Tom Sawyer look-alike will win a 6-by-9 plush rug from A.R. Kramer & Co. of Livonia and a dinner at York Steak House of Westland.

The Becky winner will take home a chaise longue from Jimmie's Rustics, Inc. of Livonia and have dinner at Mynk's Restaurant, Northville.

Both will get a rod and reel from Northwest Gun Shop of Redford; a set of lures from Eppinger Daredevil of Dearborn; a cutting board from the Sarver Building Boys Club of Redford; a bike CB radio from Reliable Bicycle Shop of Livonia; and a belt buckle from the Scott Colburn western shop of Livonia.

There will be many similar prizes for the runners-up.

To enter the contest, just show up at the registration table, located north of Hines Drive about a half-mile east of Newburgh Road.

Cosponsors of the derby are the Western Wayne County Conservation Club and the parks departments of Farmington, Farmington Hills, Garden City, Livonia, Northville, Plymouth, Westland and Dearborn Heights.

THAT BASS you caught from Pontiac, Kent or Whitmore lakes may have an orange tag that looks like spaghetti.

It was put there by the state Department of Natural Resources as part of a \$25,000 study of whether bass fishing is getting better compared to 20 years ago, when the last study was made.

More than 1,000 bass were given

numbered tags just below the dorsal fin earlier in the spring, said DNR fisheries biologist Ron Spittler. Then they were released in Pontiac Lake, northern Oakland County; Kent Lake, on the Oakland-Livingston border; and Whitmore Lake, on the Washtenaw-Livingston border.

In addition, some northern pike were tagged in all three lakes; tiger muskies in Pontiac and Whitmore; and walleyes in Kent.

What do you do if you land a tagged fish? Spittler replied:

"Note the tag number, length of fish, date caught and lake name."

"Mention whether you kept or released the fish. Don't remove the tag if you are releasing the fish."

Send the information to: Michigan DNR, Institute for Fisheries Research; University Museums Annex, Ann Arbor 48109.

Spittler said DNR will also use the information to compare fishing activity for various species, what the success rate is for bass, how many caught bass are released, and what has been the effect of raising the legal size limit to 12 inches in 1976.

The bottom line, he said, will show: "Can bass fishing in Michigan be improved?"

HERE'S WHERE other anglers were catchin' 'em last week, according to DNR field officers:

Bluegills and sunfish were moving into the shallows near the edges of most area lakes: Lake Sixteen bluegill fishing is excellent. Bass fishing is good on Loon, Orion, Prince and Trout lakes of Oakland County.

(I took 13 gills in the 7-8 inch class from Proud Lake one recent morning. They all hit in one spot in 3 feet of water near a weedbed, and all 13 were males. The males make the nests for the females to lay eggs in. It meant they were moving into the shallows to spawn but hadn't begun yet.)

Trout are being taken on Silver Lake, Oakland County.

Pike fishing is good to excellent on Anchor Bay of Lake St. Clair and at Harsen's Island. Use artificial lures.

Perch fishing in Lake St. Clair is slow and spotty.

The walleye run on the St. Clair River just hasn't happened yet

EVERYONE has a favorite spring blossom. Mine's the redbud. Check them out along the parkway of Lower Huron Metropark near Belleville.

If you're over on the west side of the state, the most spectacular redbud spot of all is (where else?) Redbud Trail in southern Berrien County between Berrien Springs and Buchanan.

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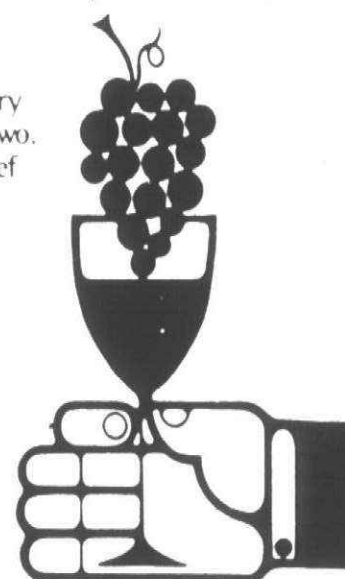

"Origins of Animation," 1 p.m. today through Sunday at the Recital Hall of the Detroit Institute of Arts, 5200 Woodward, phone 832-2730, \$1.

The institute kicks off its eight-week "Film Panorama" series — a "program of films that were made one frame at a time" — by tracing the origins of animated films.

The remainder of the series of rarely seen, early animated films and popular examples of modern cartoons runs Wednesdays through Sundays through July 27. All shows are at 1 p.m.

"Origins of Animation" runs 74 minutes and features two film documentaries: "Origins of the Motion Picture" and "Animals in Motion," as well as original animated films made by Emile Cohl between 1908 and 1910.

The documentaries examine the animation "toys" of the 19th century — Zoetropes and Praxinoscopes — and the photographic studies of animal locomotives done by Eadweard Muybridge from 1875 to 1880.

One of the best Cohl films of the 200 he made

between 1908 and 1918 is "Phantasmagorie," his first, and it will be shown at the institute.

Cohl was a leading newspaper cartoonist and photographer in France before he became interested in animated films. Though his work in animation had to be reduced to the simplest of lines and figures, his characters take on lively mannerisms and expressions.

His favorite character, Fantoche, became the prototype of all the later "little men" of the cartoon world and perhaps served as a model for the character developed by Charlie Chaplin.

"Film Panorama" continues on Wednesday with a program called "Early Traditions" that features films made between 1909 and 1919. Among them: "Gertie the Dinosaur" and "Krazy Kat."

New California releases meet all expectations

Judging from the response received for addresses to obtain copies of free winery newsletters (March 27 issue), there seems to be strong interest in following the wine scene.

So here's another recommendation — one that is, alas, not free, but well worth the minimum investment for those who are serious about their wine consumption.

It's the "Wine Spectator," published every other week as a wine newspaper, for \$25 a year. Write for particulars to 4017 Brant Street, San Diego, Calif. 92103. An excellent resident staff and outsiders keep us abreast of wine releases and developments.

The classified section toward the back of each issue carries names of other trade publications and subscription newsletters available as well as ads for regional and national wine outlets. There are many publications, both promotional and analytical, designed to keep you contemporary. (A few local merchants have copies of the "Wine Spectator" available if you wish to go that route.)

AND WHILE endorsements are flowing, here are a couple of others. Two exceptional new wines, both initial releases, came out of California this late spring.

The first is a much acclaimed Jordan Winery 1976 Cabernet Sauvignon. So much mystique and ballyhoo have not been previously generated for a wine ahead of its release, but it lives up to all expectations.

A VERY elegant wine, containing many layers of taste sensation, this is a truly classy bottle. Don't look for a tannic monster here. This is ready to drink now, though some aging will enhance it. Some 30,000 cases were made and it is now available here in limited supply.

The other release of true excellence comes amid no fanfare and unfortunately you'll need to go to California to get it. It's from a small mountain winery in southern Napa, Quail Ridge, a 1978 Chardonnay. There are two "lots."

The lot one is a buttery, vanillin, subtly rich yet beautiful balanced thing. This is a wine of grace, not mouth. Have your California friends find you a bottle or two if they can. A beautiful wine.

The lot two is, according to reviews, a fuller, even more complex wine. I'm still trying to get a bottle of that myself.

AND TWO new editions of wine book classics from Signet are in 1980 editions. "The New Signet Book of Wine," by Alexis Bespaloff, and "The Signet Book of American Wine," by Peter Guimne. Both have substantial new material, are well written and contain generous amounts of information in concise formats.

Either seems an excellent introduction to its field and has information for the more advanced student as well. At \$2.25 and \$2.50 respectively, you'll get enough change from a 10 dollar bill to buy a good bottle to drink as you read.

To be purchased only with great caution is the product of another winery new to Michigan. That is Lawrence, which a group of generics and varietals now on our shelves, made in the San Luis Obispo area. For the most part the varietals are simplistic, sweet and a bit overpriced. Buy with restraint. The generics are a fair value.

WHEN IN DOUBT, DUPLICATE
 Duplication plays an important role in backgammon.

The philosophy is unique. If your opponent needs a certain number to accomplish his next move, you should — with your present roll — move your checkers to force a duplication of that same number. Barring doubles, he will not be able to accomplish his objective, whether it is returning from the bar, moving around the board to a safe point, or hitting.

In the example, white has rolled six-two. With at least six possible moves, what would be your suggested play?

THE MOVE
 The move that plays best in this situation is duplicating black's three's. By white moving from black's 8 point to

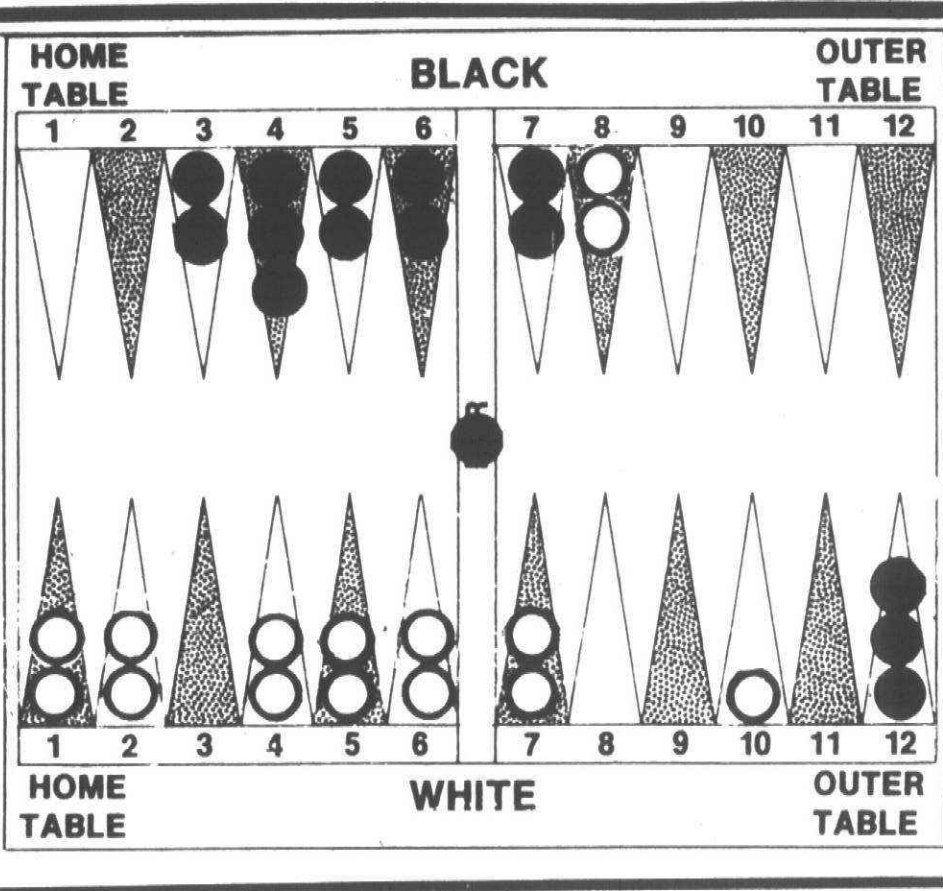
black's 10 and white's 11 point, he has effectively duplicated the number three.

Since black needs a three to re-enter from the bar (which he may or may not roll), black has to roll double three's (1 out of 36 chances) immediately to be back in the game. This is the only way the slotted checker on black's 10 point could be hit.

If white remains on black's 8 point, black could get off the bar and intimidate white as he tries to clear the mid-point (12 point).

Although duplication should not be misused, in some situations it is a must.
