

### Board forms agency to clip business woes

A long-standing rift between township government and the business community will be spotlighted and dissected by a new task force on business problems.

The committee will make recommendations to the Canton Board for solution of problems related to township ordinances or regulations.

The agency was suggested by the Chamber of Commerce "as a vehicle for the business sector to express its views."

With its composition still undecided, the committee had its first possible case only minutes after a unanimous Township Board vote created the task force Tuesday night.

"This is only the tip of the iceberg," said Chamber of Commerce President Frank McMurray of a sign dispute between a restaurant owner and the township.

McMurray said the case involving Lucie's restaurant at Ford and Lilley is a good example of the types of prob-

lems which the task force will explore.

Lucie Daniels, owner of the restaurant, has been ordered to remove a portion of a non-conforming business sign after changing the lettering on the display.

The township's zoning ordinance prohibits changing a free-standing sign larger than 25 feet in area unless steps are taken to make the sign "less non-conforming," said ordinance director Bruce Phillips.

Mrs. Daniels agreed to remove the bottom face of her sign last month in

order to change the lettering on the top portion from the "Canton House" to "Lucie's." On Tuesday, Mrs. Daniels asked to be exempted from the requirement because of the estimated \$500 cost.

But the board directed Mrs. Daniels to remove the bottom of the sign within 90 days.

McMurray said the same requirement would force changes on 99 percent of the township's freestanding signs in the event of a business trans-

There are problems business people have because of ordinances on the book," said McMurray, who also sits on the Canton Planning Commission. "Our small businesses are providing a lot of tax base. But I felt there was no vehicle for them to express their views."

The board resolution establishing the task force directs McMurray and township Supervisor Noel Culbert to submit a recommendation on the composition of the new agency.

In a letter to the board, Culbert suggested a "balanced" membership,

comprised of a Township Board member, a planning commissioner, a private citizen and a representative from a homeowner's group.

"There's an old adage that you take the first step to settling disputes if you can sit down with the other guy, see things from his point of view, and he from yours," Culbert said.

"This task force will allow us to see the chamber's point of view and, just as important, they can see things from the township's."

### Kennel life is cat's meow

#### Breeding felines is labor of love

Life is pretty soft in Kittyville, Canton Township, Mich.

Eat a little . . . lie in the sun or the shade (take your pick) . . . and have a nice, long nap every day. If you feel especially frisky, there are lots of feline friends who are willing to frolic.

"Kittyville" is the name that Norma Carroll calls her cattery, where she raises long-haired Persian cats for shows and breeding. Tucked away on five acres on Joy Road west of Ridge in Canton Township are the Carroll family home and a few kennels where most of the cats are kept.

SUMMER IS a slow time, said Mrs. Carroll. The cats have shed their long coats and don't have the sleek hair more typical of winter months.

The next flurry of activity will come next month, when Mrs. Carroll begins to groom some of the cats for a show at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Dearborn.

"When they go to the show, we bathe

and condition (the hair)," said Mrs. Carroll. "We feed them egg yolks.

"Cats don't mind bathing, if you start young," she added.

Mrs. Carroll and her husband Bob, an architectural designer, have lived in Canton Township for 13 years. The for-

mer Livonians have eight children.

Raising cats is Mrs. Carroll's labor of love — one that dates back to the early 1950's.

After working and training for the secretarial and nursing fields, "this is

for me," said Mrs. Carroll.

"I like their sweet temperament," she added. "I've nursed countless kittens back to health. I have boxes and boxes of show ribbons and rosettes.

### Thief grabs 'bug killers'

More residents than usual may be slapping away mosquitoes and cursing the person who stole their "bug killer."

Police Lt. Larry Stewart said five Canton Township residents this week have reported thefts of devices which electrocute mosquitoes.

The most recent rash of thefts occurred in the vicinity of Cherry Hill, between Lilley and Sheldon. There have been about 50 thefts recently, said Stewart.

THE DEVICE contains an ultraviolet light which gives off a bluish glow, attracting the pesky critters.

Around the light is an electrified mesh. The mosquito is electrocuted as it flies toward the light.

The bug killers are valued at between \$90-120, according to local hardware stores. Stewart said apparently someone has been sneaking into back yards during the night, unplugging the cord and lifting the device off the hook.

"If the view is clear, you can see the glow for miles," said Stewart. "It's like

taking a hanging planter. Nobody hears anything — nobody sees anything, not in a single case."

Stewart suggests that homeowners place the devices on closed hooks to make it more difficult to remove it.

While some persons may be taking the devices for their own personal use, five thefts in a certain vicinity would "imply" that some are being resold, said Stewart.

He added that anyone with information should call the police department at 397-3000.

### News folks come to town

The 60 television technicians, reporters and media persons staying at the Knight's Inn motel won't be greeted by a fanfare of trumpets.

There won't be a serving of wenchers or court jesters, either — just a clean, "no frills" motel nestled behind the Bob Evans Restaurant on Ford Road and I-275.

The paint was barely dry at the newly-opened, 107-room motel last February when manager Andy Panda began

knocking on the doors of folks who were coordinating visitors' rooms for the Republican Convention. As a result, the 60 visitors will be staying at Knight's Inn.

Some 14,000 other convention workers and delegates are expected to be in the Detroit area, said a convention spokeswoman.

"They (the planning committees) were overjoyed to hear from me," said Panda. "It gave them an opportunity to unload some less desirable places to

stay. I had no idea (housing) was so desperate."

WHILE PANDA is rolling out the welcome mat, members of the Canton Township Chamber of Commerce and local persons are putting together packets of information for the visitors.

"We will have maps and flyers from the merchants," said Flossie Tonda, of Canton Township, who is working on the convention's Host Committee. "We don't want them (visitors) to forget us."



Knight's Inn reservations clerk Roxanne Howard, of Canton, said most of the media people will be coming in this week, although several from ABC News already have arrived.

### Adult foster homes swing into operation

Without fanfare, two group homes for mentally retarded adults have opened in Canton Township in the past week.

Clients now are being moved into the homes by Alternative Services of Royal Oak, the non-profit corporation that will operate them. Art Mack of Alternative Services said the homes recently received licensing approval from the state Department of Social Services.

One home is on Haggerty, north of Palmer. It will house six women, said Mack.

The other is on Roundtable Drive, south of Palmer and east of Morton Taylor. Four men now are living in the home, and two women are expected to

arrive shortly, Mack added.

Mack said the owner of the Roundtable site apparently changed his mind about leasing the house to Alternative Services. In February, shortly after the site was proposed, there had been some opposition from neighbors.

However, Mack said he has been meeting recently with area residents, and the move-in is "going very smoothly."

"It is our experience that this original shock wave fades away," said Mack.

Under state law, mentally retarded persons may be placed in group homes if they would benefit from a less restrictive, non-institutional lifestyle.

### Trustee hopefuls square off

#### Robert Padget

Dianne Neihengen would "refuse to be a Tuesday night trustee." "Trustees should be available," she says. "You have to be down at township hall and ask questions. You have to attend staff meetings and meet with department heads."

A member of the planning commission, Ms. Neihengen says she already spends much time at township hall. She holds no other employment.

A resident of Canton since 1975, Ms. Neihengen is seeking her first elective position as a Democrat. Eight other Democrats and six Republicans are competing for four available trustee positions.

"The thing that disturbs me is that some people seem to think that just picking a goal is doing a job," said Ms. Neihengen. "My reasons for seeking public office are to insure that the township does more than simply agree to the worthiness of a goal."

SHE CITES farmland preservation as a good example. "For all these years, it's been a beautiful conceptual goal," she said. "There is no program right now.

Even if we had the (development rights) money tomorrow, we couldn't disburse it."

A member of the farmland preservation committee, Ms. Neihengen sees an "urgent" need to establish an administrative structure for the program.

Robert Padget's family settled in Canton Township in 1835.

Except for a 12-year period following his marriage, Padget, 40, has lived in Canton his entire life.

He is chairperson of the Canton Planning Commission and a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals and Economic Development Corp. He also served on the Farmland Preservation Education Committee, the Growth Management Study Advisory Committee and the Land Use Study Committee.

"I think I've built up the background and experience that places me in a position to serve effectively," Padget said of his first bid for a township trustee position.

He will run as a Republican despite his opposition to partisan politics in local campaigns. Fifteen candidates are vying for four available trustee positions.

PADGET IS ONE of several citizens who has pushed for another farmland millage request.

Although supportive of saving Canton's agricultural land, Padget maintains "that the present program borders on confiscation of property rights."

"Unless we do something soon, it's not going to be legally defensible," he said of zoning in western Canton.

"We spent two years chasing rain-bows (for non-local development right monies). We're going to have to do it for ourselves.

# Taxi owner doubts boon

The Republican national convention opening in Detroit Monday will be a boon to some Detroit and suburban businesses, but a local taxi owner doubts it will help them.

That is the feeling of Vernon Foster, owner of Northwest Transport Inc.

Foster, who has cabs in Livonia, Garden City, Redford, Westland, Plymouth, with some runs to Farmington and Farmington Hills, said the taxi industry is feeling the recession the same as many other businesses.

"In the first place," Foster said, "the Detroit Department of Transportation (D-DOT) — assuming an employees' union strike is over by Monday — will

be traveling from downtown Detroit to the various hotels and motels in the metropolitan area. This will cut, to a great extent, the business for taxi cabs."

"Then there are the private cars, some provided by various manufacturers for the delegates and their parties. There is a lot of subsidized transportation."

"Many of the wives and guests of the delegates spend most of their time near their hotel or motel, doing their shopping in that area rather than taking a cab and traveling around the metropolitan area."

**FOSTER SAID** the 1,800-member Metro Cab Association feels no one in the group will have any increase in

business because of the convention.

He said he wasn't planning on adding any more cabs to his fleet of 36.

"The cab business is dead because of the recession. Dial-a-Ride (public transportation programs which offer door-to-door service) has also hurt our industry," he added.

"SEMATA is our biggest competitor. They apparently are trying to get into the cab business."

According to Foster, there is a report within the cab industry that attendance at the GOP convention won't be as big as expected.

"We've heard there have been rooms canceled at several hotels and motels. The edge has been taken off the con-

vention, we hear, because it appears that Ronald Reagan is almost a certain shoe-in as the Republican candidate for president."


Persons who use taxis during the convention won't be paying any higher rate than, at least not as far as Foster's cabs are concerned.

"WE INTEND to keep the normal rate. But you know, it is a funny thing. If hotel rooms, meals, entertainment prices are hiked during a convention, the public doesn't consider it gouging — just good business."

Yet they will complain about the price of a taxi trip and if it is more than they figure it should be the customer will say the taxi drivers are taking advantage of the convention and are gouging the public."

Foster, who started his Livonia-based cab business in 1957, said his first company was Yellow and Red Cab. He later purchased Suburban Checker Cab Inc., a subsidiary of Detroit Checker Cab.

"I can't get excited about the GOP convention. I'll just take the convention as it comes, but I'm not expecting any business rush as the result of it."

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# Culbert proposes industrial specialist job

Supervisor Noel Culbert is proposing the creation of an industrial coordinator position, saying "we look like a bunch of damn amateurs" in competing for industry.

Culbert plans to seek Township Board authorization for the position later this month in hopes of hiring the industrial specialist by fall.

A \$25,000 chunk of revenue sharing funds has been set aside for the coordinator's salary.

Culbert expects that a segment of Haggerty will be paved by next spring and unlock some 500 acres near Warren and Haggerty for industrial devel-

opment. Improvements to the water distribution system should alleviate Canton's water pressure problems soon.

Culbert says the time is now right to revive last year's talk of hiring an industrial specialist. The coordinator would make contact with industrial prospects, conducting a sales campaign to help fatten the township's tax base.

Members of Canton's commercial and industrial Committee now speak with interested developers as do Culbert and various township employees.

"We're going to be competing with some real aggressive cities," said Cul-

bert. "The coordinator would put us up in the professional category."

**THE PROPOSAL** comes few weeks before the Aug. 5 primary, when Culbert and three other candidates will compete for the Democratic supervisor's nomination.

For the first time, talk of needing more industry has characterized a Canton election campaign.

Culbert admits that his own platform in 1978 did not highlight industrial needs.

But the supervisor insists that his proposal has nothing to do with the

forthcoming election or increasing talk among candidates of the need for industrial development.

"The time is just appropriate, election or not," Culbert said.

"I don't think industrial development was ever a big issue in Canton. But because of high taxes, I think people are waking up to the fact that we need industry."

"Frankly, I would like to hear what the other candidates have to say about this. It's easy to say you want industrial development. But are you willing to put your money where your mouth is?"

Culbert said he originally planned to

revive talk of hiring a coordinator next fall.

But he pushed up his plans after a former industrial coordinator for the city of Westland approached the supervisor on an unrelated issue.

"I ASKED HIM what he did for a living and we started to talk," Culbert said. "The thing that hits you between the eyes is that no one here has expertise on those kinds of things."

Culbert says Canton must aggressively seek industry. No one does that now.

"Communities with good industrial development all have industrial coordi-

nators. I realize this will be a controversial issue with the board, because it involves spending money. But sometimes you have to spend money to get money," Culbert said.

The supervisor said industry normally take six months to a year to finalize a move to another community. He expects that 128 acres owned by Canton Township at Warren and Haggerty will be ready for development by next summer.

Paving a one-mile stretch of Haggerty near the industrial property has held up township plans to sell the land to developers.

## Loving care gives boost to newborn kittens

"It's expensive — food and kitty litter and special heating," she continued. "I do it because I love the animals."

**HOW MANY** cats has Mrs. Carroll raised? She can't even make a guess.

In the meantime, there are cats in white and silver, and dark felines with copper-colored eyes who slumber in the sun. Cuddled up to larger cats are blue-eyed kittens no larger than mice.

And there is one cat which currently is keeping a protective eye on a Pekingese puppy, born more than five weeks ago with a cleft palate.

The sale of kittens as pets is an offshoot of breeding for shows, and usually takes place after the animal is at least two months old. The price runs from \$75-150 for kittens without papers.

Show animals can cost several hundred dollars, said Mrs. Carroll.

"Show cats aren't pretty," explained Mrs. Carroll. They have flat faces and appear to be baring their teeth.

"You're trying to breed the perfect cat," she added. "You're

trying to conform to the standard for each color and breed," as set by the Cat Fanciers' Association.

The Cat Fanciers' Association is the American Kennel Club for cats.


"Because you get more kittens, you have to sell them," explained Mrs. Carroll. "They couldn't begin to pay for the cost."

The cats have to be fed, watered and cared for daily. Food is placed on pieces of waxed paper, which can be discarded when the meal is consumed.

One of the kennels used to be a greenhouse and is light and airy. Periodically, cats are allowed out of their cages and permitted to roam and exercise in a large, open space.

**THE ANIMALS** are same-sex segregated except during breeding periods. Kittens, born after a gestation period of 63-65 days, often are fed baby food and nursed carefully.

"They have to be helped along," explained Mrs. Carroll. "Some of the purebreds have lost the instinctive maternal nature because they have been pampered show cats for many generations."

## Padget pushes for vote to settle farmland issue

"It has to go back on the ballot — and fairly soon."

Padget says the Township Board should consider partial funding of a development rights program "to bail out" landowners who need the money now. Additional millage for a total program could be requested at a later date.

"I think there has to be a public commitment to the program," Padget said.

"I have a tremendous respect for the people. If they're given the facts, the public will make a good decision. If the public doesn't want the program, then you don't have one."

Padget says the Township Board will have to rezone western Canton — probably for large-acre homesites — "if the people really express themselves" in defeat of another millage request.

**PADGET LISTS** the need for industrial development and more recreational services as short-term priorities of the new Township Board.

Both issues go hand in hand, he said. Taxes from industry could beef up recreational offerings.

Padget says the township's planning department and Economic Development Corp. should be actively involved in soliciting industry.

"You have to put on a selling campaign," he said. "(Getting industry) is not like a stroke of lightning in the night."

The Township Board must develop "a positive atmosphere," he maintains.

"You talk to some developers, and Canton is a dirty word."

Padget says an uncooperative atmosphere "permeates the whole government structure."

"We have to develop a different attitude of sitting down and working something out. I just think it's time our township ran on a little different basis. Instead of litigation and prosecution, we should turn to cooperation, compromise, respect and dignity."

## Thief fancies TV sets, linen

Perhaps the sandy-haired young man enjoys lying in bed watching television?

The police department is issuing a flyer to Canton Township motels in the wake of three thefts during the last few weeks. In each case, a man paid in advance for one or two motel rooms.

Later, motel employees discovered their "guest" had disappeared, taking with him bed linens and color television sets. Lt. Larry Stewart said the man so far has hit three Michigan Avenue motels, most recently on June 30 and July 2.

As chairperson of the planning commission for the last four years, Padget believes that he "can bring that kind of thing to government."

**HE SEES MANY** "very, very important issues that seem to be overlooked."

"Certainly, we have to look at growth control now, while growth is slow," he said.

Padget suggests limitations on building permits as a possible method for controlling growth, but he said he sees a need for "solid rationale, or it won't be defensible."

He favors "exploration" of the township manager form of government proposed by a citizen's group.

The practice of ordinance officers carrying guns is "a sore point" with Padget.

"The more hands that have access to guns means more potential of someone getting hurt," he said.

Padget envisions formation of a senior citizens advisory council.

"I feel I've compiled the kind of experience to make me a qualified candidate. That took a lot of years. There's a lot of senior citizens who certainly have more experience than I do. We should better utilize that source of knowledge."

Padget, a supervisor of computer operations and scheduling for Ford Motor Co., believes his background in finance would be a valuable asset to the Township Board.

"I think that the electorate should look for people who are capable of listening to both sides of issues and making decisions on that basis. I think I have a proven track record in that area," said Padget. Padget is past national director of the Jaycees as well as past Michigan president and vice-president. He served on the board of directors of the Michigan Kidney Foundation, the Michigan Jaycee Foundation and Western Wayne County United Community Services.

There also was a theft a few weeks earlier, added Stewart.

Stewart said the man registered under the names of John Van Dell, Bob Anderson and Richard Skyles, giving a "fictitious" Belleville address.


The man, who was driving a late model, dark pickup truck, gave similar license plate numbers of DLS-460 and DSL-640, said Stewart. "Neither plate is correct," he added.

The man was described as in his 20's, 5-7 to six feet tall with sandy, collar-length hair and about 150-165 pounds.



# Neihengen says 'Act on goals'

Development right costs must be updated. Land must be assessed, and government contact should be made with individual farmers. Landowners in the agricultural district should be exempted for some ordinance requirements, she says.

As for development right monies, Ms. Neihengen says several sources of revenue should be considered.

"The people who talk about farmland either see it as levying a millage or going to private foundations. We should look at other things."

She favors allocating some revenue sharing funds for farmland preservation and asking voters for a small millage. In the meantime, the township should consider its search for foundation grants and other non-local monies.

Officials should investigate the possibility of helping farmers through Economic Development Corp. (EDC) financing.

Ms. Neihengen has helped organize a township farmers' market.

She favors establishment of a regional farmers' market in a permanent building. The township should research the availability of federal funds for the market through the establishment of food co-ops for low-income residents.

MS. NEIHENGEN agrees with most other candidates when she says industry is crucially needed in Canton.

"But you don't attract it," she says. "You selectively recruit it. The township has to decide what it wants. You have to use industry to compliment your goals."

Ms. Neihengen sees a danger in advertising a blanket welcome for indus-

try. Under state zoning law, all types of development must be permitted in a community.

"You have to be very careful. I haven't heard one person talk about environmentally safe industry."

Ms. Neihengen endorses hiring an industrial coordinator to contact industries which are desirable to Canton.

She sees an additional need to survey existing businesses and industries through a joint effort of township government and the Chamber of Commerce.

"Who's telling (developers) about Canton?" she asked. "Where are they getting their information?"

"They should be told about farmland preservation. They also need to know that if they're the fifth delicatessen coming in, there may not be a market."

Ms. Neihengen says existing businesses "need to know the market situation too."

The Township Board and chamber should meet regularly to discuss concerns of the business community, she says.

PLANS FOR NEW commercial and residential developments should keep the pedestrian in mind, added Ms. Neihengen.

She endorses plans for a "downtown" Canton, a concept now being explored by the planning commission.

"People like to stroll and browse (in commercial areas), she said. "But when you have continuous strip shopping, people have no incentive to do that. When people aren't pleased, they're not going to be good consumers."

Ms. Neihengen favors earmarking a

portion of revenue sharing funds for recreation. Existing parks should be completed, and more open space and picnic areas should be provided.

Police and fire are vital," said Ms. Neihengen. "But recreation is essential."

She suggests a return to Planned Unit Development (PUD) zonings, a move now being investigated by the planning commission. In PUD residential areas, parks are provided.

Ms. Neihengen said the township should consider locating PUD parks in areas with access to major roads. Canton workers could maintain the facilities for township-wide use.

She favors investigating a move of West Bloomfield Township to establish

its own road commission. The Oakland County Township receives a share of state gasoline and weight fees for the paving and maintenance of roads under the arrangement.

She says the township should plan ahead for eventual construction of senior citizen housing.

Ms. Neihengen holds a bachelors degree in social work from the University of Dayton. She is an alternate delegate to the Plymouth Community School Council from Hulsing School, a past board member of the Fellows Creek Subdivision Civic Association and past president of the Eriksson School PTO. She is a former religious education teacher at St. Thomas a Becket parish.





# Sale of Penniman mall's wall results in mid-week clean up

Clean-up at the site of the burned-out Penniman Ave. Shops and neighboring Stanwood, Polak and Morrison accounting office was expected to begin Wednesday morning in downtown Plymouth.

After several months of negotiations, agreement was reached between the property owners of both businesses that would clear the way for the demolition and totally negate possible legal action by the city of Plymouth.

William Morrison Jr., owner of the accounting firm, says he now plans to

rebuild at the site with hopes of completion by Thanksgiving.

Meanwhile, David Pugh says he and his partner, Rod Cannon, who owned the Penniman mall building, also plan to rebuild at the site.

"If things go as planned," said Pugh, they would re-open in early 1981. Those plans hinge on financial arrangements.

At this point, he added, the partners have not decided whether they will rebuild a mall of specialty shops there. However, they have considered building a complex with retail shops and business offices.

Both businesses were effected by a fire that struck in mid-February. While all 11 specialty shops in the Penniman mall were destroyed, the accounting firm was less severely effected. The accounting firm has since temporarily relocated its operations in Plymouth Township.

The decision to demolish the former Penniman mall site and rebuild the accounting firm was reached last week.

It followed pressure from the city's building department, which last month began moves to condemn the site. That action was never completed.

The department had demanded that both business sites be cleared but was swayed when Morrison produced engineering studies that confirmed his opinion that remodeling was safe.

At question was a common wall, on property owned by Pugh and Cannon, that once supported both buildings.

To resolve the issue, Morrison purchased the burned out wall "for a nominal fee," says Pugh, from the Penniman partners so that he could remodel his structure.

A contractor from Southfield has been secured to rebuild the wall.



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


# Project Target designed to help the jobless

So you say you're out of work and need a job? Make your first stop Project Target, one of 10 programs operated under the special projects department of Wayne-Westland Community Schools.

The program consists of an intensive, three-week workshop designed to provide the skills necessary to get a job. It's open to those 18 and older who are unemployed.

"We do an assessment of their skills, determine their career capability," said Lonnie Vitale who heads the program. "We talk about what they can do now and how they can reach their future goals."

Ms. Vitale says she hopes to help 200 unemployed area residents between

now and September, placing at least 132 of them in jobs. The program is open to anyone from Western Wayne County except Detroit, Dearborn and Livonia. It is funded by a grant of \$200,000 for a four-month period from the Wayne County Office of Manpower and the Department of Labor.

"Job hunting is very threatening to all of us," Ms. Vitale added. "We try to get the level of their self-confidence up, providing whatever support services they need."

That support can include medical and dental care. While child care isn't provided currently during the summer months for this program, Ms. Vitale said counselors will help clients work out such problems in an interview

preceding their beginning the workshop.

From seven to 10 three-week sessions will be offered this summer. Students are required to attend from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and are paid a \$3.10 per hour non-taxable stipend if they do attend and are on time.

"We'll run a program at night if we find there is a need," said Beverly Stanton, who directs the special projects department at John Glenn High School.

Included in the program is counseling on both a group and individual basis, development of job hunting skills and helping match jobs with seekers.

"Surprisingly, a lot of people think they know how to apply for a job, but our experience shows they don't," said Stanton.

Participants in the program learn such skills as resume writing, interviewing and where to look for jobs.

Counseling ranges from personal problems on an individual basis to work-related behavior in group sessions under the guidance of highly trained counselors, according to Ms. Vitale.

"Most people lose a job because of a lack of interpersonal behavior skills," she explained. "We try to reinforce them. We let them see themselves on tape during the third week of the program."

That week also includes time for job

searches at a phone bank in the school and through career exploration on a computer terminal.

"Even in a recession, jobs are available," said Ms. Vitale. "Employers are more selective. So we help our clients be the best possible candidate."

"You never get a second chance to make a first impression," she added. But job seekers have to realize, they said, that "high salaries are unrealistic in this job market."

The program helps provide support

in adjusting to new lifestyles and continues to work with clients on a follow-up basis once they have found a job, explained Ms. Vitale.

The special projects department has developed credibility with employers, according to Ms. Stanton, who are now starting to seek employees through the department.

"We're particularly interested in small businesses who need dependable employees," she said.

## Suspect sought in fast food break-in

Wayne County Sheriffs are investigating a break-in at the Kentucky Fried Chicken Restaurant in Plymouth Township last weekend that netted some \$1,500 from two floor safes.

According to Det. Frank Burton, the break-in occurred sometime Saturday

morning. Police believe entry was gained through the front door as the door's window was shattered. Police also found the rear door left open.

Deputies were alerted to the break-in when a motorist contacted them about 2:30 a.m. saying he saw a man running

from the fast-food store at 1349 Ann Arbor Road.

The two floor safes were located on top of each other and were found lifted out of the floor. Police would not say whether forced entry was used to gain access to the stored cash.

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
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
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## With 20,000 strangers, every kind word helps

"There I was, a traveler lost in a strange country, unable to regain my bearings because I could neither speak nor read German. I was on a train headed, I thought, to a small town

"But now the names of the towns we passed through didn't match those on my map. A sick feeling crept into the pit of my stomach. I had visions of ending up in Siberia.

"Clutching my rumpled map, I feverishly walked from car to car seeking someone who could speak English, or even a little French. After several blank stares, I came upon a Danish woman who figured out where I could change trains and get back on the right track.

"That was the last I saw of her, but I still feel that Denmark must be the friendliest country in the world."

A FEW KIND WORDS and some helpfulness go a long way when you're a stranger in a strange town.

Any of us may have an opportunity to be helpful next week as 20,000 strangers — delegates, party staff and news people — pour in from all over the country as the Republican National Convention selects its presidential team. We'll all be speaking the same language, fortunately, but there still will be plenty of people trying to discover where to go and how to get there.

We, the people on the front lines in this exciting venture, will form their lasting impressions of metropolitan Detroit. If we are rude — or even indif-

ferent — they won't enjoy their stay here and avoid returning.

But if we go out of our ways to be helpful and express our pride in our home, they'll have a pleasant trip and will return. And we may make some valuable friends in the process.

WHY ARE WE so concerned about the impression they leave with?

The convention is expected to bring more than \$40 million in business to the metropolitan area. That figure is minuscule compared to the long-term effect a favorable impression will have on our tourist and convention business. With other industries in our state suffering, tourism is looking more and more critical to our survival.

The conventioners will be here on serious business, and an estimated 75 percent of their time will be spent within a mile or two of their hotels. Nevertheless, you may run into our guests during the daytime hours when sightseeing and shopping will be on their minds.

There will be no battle over the presidential nomination, so many of the 8,000 news persons will focus on what's happening in our town. The Detroit city workers' strike may hurt that impression.

But the people-to-people contact can overcome that and any other problems that may arise.

Like the Danish woman who treated one of us with simple kindness, our warmth and friendliness will make our guests understand how delighted and honored we feel to be hosting a national convention — and how proud we are of our town.

## Like Stassen, teen drinking is back on ballot


I'll bet you thought the flap over the drinking age ended when it was officially declared only those 21 years or older were mature enough to immerse their brain tissues in alcohol.

Forget that notion. Like Napoleon, the drinking age debate has returned from exile once again to do battle.

We've got a new group, Citizens for a Fair Drinking Age (CFDA), which advocates lowering the drinking age to 19. The group is spearheading a drive to have the question put on the November ballot so the electorate may once again decide.

FOR SOME unexplainable reason, Michigan residents and politicians enjoy debating the drinking issue more than just about anything else. Tax reform, education, PBB and ERA pale in the eyes of Michigan voters when stacked next to this issue which comes back, year after year, like Stassen.

Recall that in 1972 it was decided 18-year-olds



were mature enough to join us legally at the bar stool.

But the idea of our kid sister or brother joining us in the inner sanctum of the local pub was just too much for some folks to accept. So the age was

cranked up to 19 by the Michigan Legislature and, a few months later, to 21 by the voters.

The Michigan Sheriffs' Association has joined in this latest crusade to roll back the age. Its logic is that 19- and 20-year-olds are continuing to sash down the brew anyway, and it's a pain to try to enforce an unenforceable law.

THE REASONS, pro and con, can be debated endlessly. In Michigan they have been, and probably will be for years to come—and therein lies a real problem.

Government at all levels has suffered from a credibility gap for years. This is true especially among younger persons just breaking in to the political system.

In many ways, government of, by and for the people has become a big joke.

The drinking age debate is a good example of why it has happened.

Michigan voters must be able to decide, once and

for all, at what age they want to permit persons to purchase alcohol. In truth, it matters little whether that age is 15 or 50. Consuming alcohol is an American way of life, whether we like it or not.

Teenagers are going to drink alcohol, just like their parents, legally or otherwise. But that is another debate grounded in this country's sociological fabric.

What must be preserved, in this case, is a faith that government can make a decision and stick with it for more than two years at a whack.

At this point, Michigan youth only can look at "government by the people" and scoff at its uncertainty.

AS ONE STATE legislator put it, making it illegal for 19- and 20-year olds to drink in Michigan didn't suddenly create a class of abstainers.

It only created confusion in the minds of many as to what role government plays in our lives.

## Water system edges toward regionalism

Slowly, slowly, ever so slowly, John Feikens is beginning to see the light.

Last week the chief U.S. District Court judge proposed that the suburbs be allowed at least to nominate members of the Detroit Water Board.

As presiding judge in the case of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency vs. Detroit, Feikens has moved over the years to force the city — whose system serves 100 communities with water and 70 with sewage treatment — to clean up its sewer plant.


At first it seemed to the judge to be a case of upgrading the equipment and operating things better. He was unable to put his finger on the real sore spot — that Detroit alone lacks the management and labor skills to set things aright; and that a regional service requires a regional governing board and regional labor force.

Feikens' first step was to appoint Detroit Mayor Coleman Young as a special administrator with wide powers to straighten out the operation. It was, as many observers have wryly noted, like appointing the fox to guard the chicken coop.

THE DETROIT Water Board consists of seven members, all appointed by the mayor. Unlike members of your local planning commission, water board members lack a fixed, guaranteed term of office. They may be removed by the mayor at will.

In practice, Detroit mayors have appointed three suburbanites and four Detroiters. The violation this does to the notion of "one person, one vote" is too gross to dwell upon. This aggravated the situation in which the so-called suburban members weren't really suburbia's own but Young's hand-picked suburbanites.

Moreover, Detroit doesn't "own" the water-



sewerage system in the sense that it has invested taxpayers' money. The capital came from 1) state grants, 2) federal grants and 3) user charges.

With only one-third of the region's population, Detroit simply has no right to four-sevenths of the water board's seats, seven-sevenths of the appointment power and all the jobs.

SO FEIKENS proposes that outer Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties each nominate three persons for water board posts. Mayor Young would then select one of the three nominees from each county.

Feikens' logic is that the mayor would retain actual appointment power, but the customer communities would be assured their own choices would serve.

That, said Oakland County Drain Commissioner George Kuhn, "could be tokenism."

It not only could be tokenism, it is tokenism. It's bad news.

The good news is that Feikens has become at least dimly aware of the fact that the water-sewer system needs massive structural reform. The bad news is that he apparently fails to realize how massive.

The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments really should be taking a leadership role in seeking a regional structure for a regional agency. But SEMCOG is strangely inert.

So with Feikens slow on the draw and with SEMCOG inert, the only game in town is Kuhn's own petition drive. He and many suburban officials seek a 1982 referendum on their complex plan to regionalize the water board.

It sure beats waiting for the federal judiciary to get a grip on the problem.

## Old-time editors' rules

One pleasantry of spending more than a half-century putting one word after the other in the field of journalism is the opportunity to chuckle again at some of the rules laid down by the editors for whom he has toiled.

Over the years The Stroller has "toiled" under the watchful eye of a series of editors and owners who have laid down some very unusual rules which seem more unusual as time goes by.

For instance, there was a time when The Stroller was trying to fight off poverty as a member of the sports staff of the Detroit Free Press that the late E.D. Stair, the owner, took a hand in issuing strict orders. And they caused a laugh.

MR. STAIR, a kindly old gent who owned four of the legitimate theaters in downtown Detroit, fretted that sports events got so much publicity compared to the theaters. So he ordered that all stories on the sports pages include attendance figures for the day.

On one occasion, The Stroller forgot to mention the figure in his story of the Tigers. As soon as the paper was off the press, Mr. Stair told him he had disobeyed the rule and that amends had to be made. On the spot, Mr. Stair took pencil in hand and re-wrote the opening sentence to say:

"Only 14,000 fans saw the Tigers win another ball game."


Mr. Stair leaned back in his chair and smiled, "Now you see what I mean."

His rule lasted only a week or two. It became a joke when every story started the same way.

A RULE laid down by Malcolm Bingay, long the editorial director of the Free Press, caused a bit of laughter:

"Henceforth, no story in this paper shall begin with the words 'The', 'A' or 'An'."

Try that one some time. It may not be as easy as you think.

Bingay decided to make the trip to Chicago with the sports writers. He suggested we have a meeting at breakfast the next morning to lay out plans for the day.

Breakfast finished, he left a quarter on the table as a tip.

"You are going to have a helluva time staying within \$1 a day if you tip that much for breakfast," The Stroller pointed out.

"That's right," Bingay shot back with a chuckle. "Have you any idea how we can beat the rule? After all, it can not be broken."

No one spoke up. Finally Bingay said, "Let's all ride out to the ball park in one cab and then each charge cab fare. We can do the same this evening. Will four cab fares help each of you?"

They did. And it was the first time to The Stroller's knowledge that an editor showed how his own rule could be broken.

Those editors were colorful people.

The prospect was grim. Another three hours of slogging through wet, brown bags and boxes. Applesauce and baby food jars spilled onto the city hall parking lot.

I surveyed my bloody finger, rubbed my aching back and wondered why in Creation I was there at 9:00 on a Saturday morning.

Smashingly beautiful in a tattered black jacket and worn jeans, I clumped over to the police garage to drag out a ladder. The hole in my "monster" boots collected water, but I needed them. When crushing bottles with a tamper, astride a bin of jagged glass, heavy footwear is crucial.

My huge, clumsy work gloves completed the Frankenstein look. But never mind. My work was cut out. Two tons of glass, kindly donated by conscientious citizens, begged attention.

Then I discovered the prize of the day. A blue glass compote gleamed proudly in multi-colored glory. The somewhat vulgar piece, obviously pseudo "Depression glass," lay among assorted wine and whisky bottles in the dented produce carton. I took it home.

Later, a shiny stainless table knife appeared. Its former owner had dropped it, inadvertently, in a bag of bottles. Miraculously, it matched my silverware pattern. I "recycled" it.

Buried treasures are a fringe benefit — one of the many joys of recycling.

**RECYCLE.** Before Earth Day the word meant nothing. Then came temptation, knowledge — and guilt. I consumed the apple of environmental awareness and the sin of wastefulness would burn my soul forever. And it was not enough to ban bottles from my own trash — I had to change the world.

And so it began. My life would never be the same. Nor would that of my husband and children, much to their chagrin.

Countless hours of sifting through garbage to rescue non-biodegradable glass from the landfill. Meetings, phone calls day and night. "Where do I take my newspapers?" "Must I soak off the labels?"

President of a corporation (especially a non-profit one) isn't the job it's cracked up to be. "Earth Alive Inc." became an integral part of family activities. There were incredible impositions on our time and our bodies. But, somewhat grudgingly we all (or almost all) became a family committed to conservation.

Operating a recycling center is often uncomfortable. Obvious hazards are cuts, bruises, aches and constant noise. We stuff cotton or tissue in our ears to shut out the crash of bottles in boxes or against the side of the dumpster. (Throwing bottles is a great way to deal with frustration.)

And then there are the bees. These inevitable product of summer and the sweet sticky residue in beverage containers.

Neighborhood vandals wrought havoc until Monty, a helpful hardworking foreman with the city maintenance crew, conversed with them. Now the episodes of scattered glass are rare.

**WHEN A VISITOR** with a macabre sense of humor left a dead cat in the dumpster, I had second thoughts.

Why was I sticking it out? Others went on to bigger and better things. Carolyn Place gave her customers to the county and found a paying job. Helena Sexauer closed shop in Bloomfield and now battles lake pollution. Marietta Crabtree (originator of a large recycling operation in Macomb County) was running for some office, last I heard. Still, I recycle.

I pulled a TV dinner tray out of a bag. Memories of an unforgettable encounter were unleashed.

Years before, our elementary schools served lunches on aluminum trays. Two well-meaning eco-freaks (my son and dearest friend) decried the waste. "Why don't you recycle them?" they said.

Thus began two years of frustration — all to teach children how to save a precious, non-renewable resource. First, I organized a committee of mothers and students to rinse and store the trays. Then, school trucks hauled them to a lumber yard.

Not satisfied, I convinced the manager of Stouffer's Northland to save the large aluminum

pans used to store their special entrees. These were transported to our storage area by a group of dedicated mothers.

It all fell apart in the second year. Rinsing crews disbanded and hundreds of dirty containers attracted rodents and raccoons. The patience of the lumber yard owner was exhausted.

**ONE SNOWY** afternoon near Christmas, I fished through mounds of sticky dinner trays, gooey pans and uneraten lunches. Blobs of Stouffer's "spinach souffle" and "shrimp au gratin" gave a gourmet touch to the mess.

With my sons' help I salvaged what was possible. The next phases involved a furniture company (they donated a truck), a compactor firm (they let us borrow a compactor and baler) and a scrap dealer. He gave us all of \$75 for the entire lot — but he did accept it.

I invested this small fortune in five small trees which were planted with all due ceremony at the schools that took part in the program. Ironically, three of the five succumbed to vandalism or neglect within a few weeks. I'm not sure whether the last two survived or not.

The recollections made me doubt my sanity. Why wasn't I smart like Betty Shaw, for instance? Visions of other former recyclers came to mind. Betty managed the Redford Township center, but now she has a best-seller on conservation and works with CONCERN Inc.

Barbarda Hallman, once director of Royal Oak's center is a councilwoman.

Monica Goering, the vivacious redhead who started a large efficient recycling operation in Southfield let the city take over. Then she sold real estate for five years. Where is she now? Cultivating her organic garden. Where did I go wrong?

It was exciting to help Monica lobby for county help. The fight for the Bottle Bill was a challenge and testifying in Washington a nice change of pace. But still I recycle.

**IT MUST BE** the people. Faithful families. The



children — dainty little girls immaculately dressed, enroute to Grandma's or a party. Or rowdy ragamuffin boys, bottles in hand, begging to throw in "just one more."

That's what kept me going. Those truck drivers, maintenance men, the company president, the wine-maker who worked to earn free bottles. The high school counselor who recycled cider jugs into terrariums. (She even paid us.) All gave smiles, encouragement and pitched in and helped.

Guess I had to prove a point. Finish a job. Besides, who else would do it?

But no time to rest on laurels yet.

# Knocking off a hubby, the easy way

While watching a murder movie the other day, a familiar plot began to unfold. A young woman, in her mid-twenties, had married a wealthy middle-aged man, knowing that his fortune would someday be hers.

The years slowly passed, and she found her marriage increasingly unbearable. As she began to explore several unorthodox ways to hasten her widowhood, it struck me that there are many socially approved methods to "naturally" accomplish this end. My suggestions to her would be as follows:

1. Fatten him up. Studies have shown that the life expectancy may be shorter for people who are markedly overweight. Obesity increases the death rate from heart and other circulatory diseases, diabetes, liver and kidney disease. High calorie foods with each meal and for between-meal snacks will

accomplish this goal. (Alcohol is an excellent way to camouflage calories, since each drink contains 150-200 calories.)

2. Increase the amount of saturated fat and cholesterol in his diet. Select meats (heavily marbled with fat) and whole milk dairy products that are high in saturated fat. These foods increase the level of cholesterol in the blood and may increase the risk of coronary heart disease. Some specific suggestions include: Never bake or broil when you can fry foods; seldom serve fish or poultry since these foods contain less saturated fat than red meat; avoid cooking with vegetable oils and polyunsaturated shortenings, use butter or hydrogenated fats instead; finally, serve cholesterol-rich egg yolks as often as possible.

3. Get him accustomed to more and more salted

food. Placing the salt shaker in front of him at every meal may allow him to do his own dirty work. There is strong scientific evidence that excessive dietary salt may raise the blood pressure. Elevated blood pressure appears to increase the chances of a heart attack if it goes undetected and untreated. (To this end, discourage the importance of his regular medical checkup to detect and treat conditions that lead to heart attack.)

4. Buy him cigarettes by the carton. Cigarette smokers develop heart disease at a rate of three-six times greater than non-smokers. If heart disease doesn't get him, lung cancer may. An expensive engraved lighter, a gift from you, surely will encourage him to use the lighter often.

5. Encourage him to be as inactive as possible. The sedentary man runs almost twice the risk of

heart disease as the active man. It is important that the inactivity associated with his desk job, extend into his leisure and weekend hours. To this end, discourage a deviation from his sedentary work schedule. Regularly ridicule any suggestion he may have for moderate exercise, games or active hobbies. Encourage television, cards, bowling and spectator sports. If he enjoys playing golf, buy him a motorized golf cart to ride.

However, for those women who want their husband around for some time, take the opposite course of action to this advice. It may postpone his departure by many years, give you a virorous and grateful companion into the retirement years and provide your children's children with a grandfather they'll appreciate.

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
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# Party for 50 for inflation fighters

"It's (the promotional contest) a joint venture," said Joan Kolodziej, of SEMTA's marketing department. "It helps

them (the distributor) too.

"From time to time, we do have promotions to call attention to our service... we need to market our services as much as any company that sells a product."

Results of the contests, Ms. Kolodziej said, "are nebulous. You can't say we get 10 new riders because of this."

Because a small percentage of the total metropolitan area population rides SEMTA buses, she said, "We clearly want our names in front of the community."

The contest is primarily targeted toward existing riders through a monthly SEMTA publication available on buses and commuter trains, but "anyone is eligible to enter," said Ms. Kolodziej.

"I finally found what I wanted." Sitting behind her desk in the Markham Building on Main Street (right above the Plymouth Landing), Mrs. Judy Carmichael broke into a broad smile as she explained that she now has organized an unusual office operational concept. She not only rents offices, but office space and secretarial service when it is required.

A graduate of Bentley High school in Livonia and now a resident of Plymouth Township, Mrs. Carmichael confided that she had been on what seemed almost like an endless search for the right job that would fit in with being a mother of two children.

# 70 years of drumming, he's still going strong

The sound of the drum beats has been music to the ears of Francis McGough for more than the Bible's allotted lifespan of "three score years and 10."

Now 76 years of age and carrying his six-foot frame as straight as an arrow, he slipped into an easy chair in his home on E. Ann Arbor Trail and admitted he had been beating on the drums since he was a lad of 6, back in the coal regions of Pennsylvania.

With a hearty laugh, he stroked his thinning grey hair and scoffed at the very thought of the rumor that he was 94 and still driving his car to the homes of his students.

"No," he said, "I have quit teaching — but not practicing. I spend a few hours every day on the drums and I find that it keeps me in good spirits and brings back memories of the days when I played with some of the biggest bands and in the biggest night clubs and theaters in the country."

AS HE LET HIS memories come slipping through the mist of years, he recalled the days when he started in a theater in Wilkes-Barre in the days when there was no such thing as "talkies," and the movies were black and white.

"After a while, as I grew a bit older, I made the sound effects person backstage, lending some authenticity to the old silent movies."

It was at the Wilkes-Barre theater that he became acquainted with Eddie Gilligan and his band. That started him on the path to mingling with other name bands of the Roaring '20s and the wild '30s. There were Al Janico, John

ny Metzger and Ted Block who played the top resorts along the Atlantic seaboard.

"I even had my own band at one time," he smiled. "We played the Catskill Mountain resorts and some of the best places in New York."

"We were the first band to play 'When the Moon Came over the Mountain,' which became Kate Smith's theme song."

Leafing through heavy laden scrapbooks, he pointed to a picture of Evelyn Nesbit, who later became the wife of Harry K. Thaw. Thaw was the victim of one of the strangest murder cases in the history of New York City.

"I PLAYED FOR her when she had 14 night clubs. I was only 17 years old. Another time, I played at the old Kenmore in New York City when 'Legs' Diamond, the notorious racketeer, made that hotel his headquarters."

He recalled meeting Gene Krupa, whom he considers one of the best drummers of all time.

"Would you believe it," he asked, "that at one time I dabbled in the ice cream business? You know in those days, a fellow couldn't make a living just drumming so I got to helping to make ice cream in New Jersey. I remember that well for it was in New Jersey that I met my wife."

McGough, who in his heyday with his own band was known as "Red" McGough, came to Plymouth in 1974 and started to teach.

At one time, he had more than 40 pupils and unlike most teachers, he drove to the students' homes and gave them private instruction. Like the mailman, snow, sleet and rain did not stay him

from his appointed rounds and he seldom missed a teaching date.

Along with his individual students, he also developed the band at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church on Pennington Avenue. And he helped coach members of the drum and bugle corps in the city. He was especially interested in young drummers who belonged to the Boy Scouts.

REMEMBERING that his interviewer also was a native of the Pennsylvania Dutch Country and coal regions, he asked:

"Do you remember Butch McDevitt?"

When told that McDevitt won the race for county sheriff by visiting all the saloons, passing out the cards of his opponent, then walking out without buying a drink for the house, McGough chuckled and commented, "You sure know him."

He recalled one of the greatest political stories of those days. It concerned the statue McDevitt had made of himself. He paid all expenses and had it shipped to Washington, D.C., where it was to rub shoulders with statues of the country's leaders.

When he was denied that privilege, he brought the statue back home where it rested for more than 10 years in the railroad yards. Now, according to McGough, no one knows where it is, but Butch McDevitt has not been forgotten.

RETURNING to his drumming days, McGough recalled playing in a group Russ and Doug Egloff of Plymouth —

# Her wood-carving hobby has 'taken off'

"It's still in the hobby stage; if it was a business, it would be too much."

"It" is wood carving, an art Molly Pemberton has practiced for the past three years.

Ornately carved plaques, music boxes and stools fill a large portion of the basement of the Pemberton's Canton Township home. This where she does most of her work.

The hobby began with a carving and painting class she took in 1977.

"I've enjoyed the carving. I did a lot of practicing and ruined a lot of wood."

A member of the Canton Newcomers Club, Mrs. Pemberton says the 'craft has "definitely taken off" since the carving class. She spends four to five hours a day on her hobby, whether its actually carving wood or scheduling time for arts and crafts shows.

A TWO-YEAR Canton resident, Mrs. Pemberton says she uses pine and bass

wood, as they are the easiest to work with. The wood is purchased from a lumber yard and her husband, Gary, cuts it to size. A design is then made, and the wood is carved, stained, painted and given a finish coat. The entire process takes about four weeks, she says.

Design ideas come from people as well as painting books, and include flowers, animals, children's characters and quotations.

Although never formally trained in art, Mrs. Pemberton says she has "always enjoyed the art field."

Using a gouge, hammer and chisel, she carves a variety of items — plaques, recipe boxes, music boxes, clocks and coat racks.

"I started out with everything under the sun. I've narrowed it down to what people want."


A former teacher, Mrs. Pemberton sells her works at shows in the metropolitan area. At first, she would contact organizations about participating in shows; now, she is the one receiving the calls.

"I enjoy the shows as well as the carving. Like teaching, it's a way to meet people."

PRICES RANGE from \$5 to for a key rack to \$35 for a large clock. The fall months are the busiest, with customers buying the carved items for Christmas gifts. Last year, Mrs. Pemberton sold 10 dozen children's foot stools between October and December.

The hobby has personal as well as financial benefits. Mrs. Pemberton makes many of her own Christmas presents, and also trades craft items with other artists at the shows.





# Detroit Presbytery responds to withdrawal of Ward church

In a statement starting with "Our hearts are heavy today," officials of the Presbytery of Detroit expressed dismay at the recent withdrawal of Ward Presbyterian Church in Livonia and First Church of Trenton. The statement was signed by James Cannon, moderator, and Donald Lester, executive presbyter.

The two churches recently announced their intention to withdraw from their denomination on the basis of doctrinal differences. The vote at Ward favored the pullout 2,133-5.

Saying the purpose of their letter to church members was to set the record straight, their statement said it is "a painful thing to have the body of Christ broken."

"But it is even more painful to hear reasons given for the action which are a distortion of the facts," it added.

In an effort to explain the moves that caused the withdrawal of the churches, it addressed particularly the issue of the diety of Christ, the election of women elders in all congregations and the ownership of church property.

**THE TWO OFFICIALS** reaffirmed "to those who are aware of this matter that the United Presbyterian Church indeed does stand for the deity of Jesus Christ, and it is in no way compromising the centrality of its faith."

Discussing the election of women elders, they said that "very broad dis-

cretionary powers" are given to the presbyteries in granting exceptions to churches "while they deal with the theological dimensions of this issue."

They added: "The action suggested has not been acted on by a majority of presbyteries, thus it is not even a part of our church law. It is an issue of great concern to those who believe women are equal to men in the church. It remains for the presbyteries to determine whether this shall be a requirement."

**ADDRESSING THEMSELVES** to the issue of church property, the two leaders said that historically, "all property is held 'in trust' for the entire church."

"When a congregation dissolves, the property reverts to the presbytery, which has the responsibility of disposing of it, and utilizing resources received," they continued.

"Through the years, the courts of the land have upheld the constitution of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. on matters of property. To our knowledge, the holding of property has never been used to control the theology of a congregation. Freedom of the pulpit has been central to the tradition of our church."

Calling property "only a means to an end," the statement said the presbytery's relationship to its congregations is built upon "mutual respect and trust."

"It has been a church in which there has been considerable freedom of expression. . . . That is good. We pray it will continue," said the statement.

**IN A DETAILED** discussion of the issue of the diety of Jesus, the men pointed out that the actions of the congregations were taken on the recommendation of their pastors and sessions, growing out of the dissatisfaction of the actions of the 192nd General Assembly. Cannon and Lester said they wish "to clarify the impression left in the media regarding those actions."

They said it is implied that the 192nd General Assembly, in failing to affirm the deity of Jesus Christ, has thus denied it.

"You should understand that this confusion is based on the misrepresentation of a 'legal' opinion based on the Book of Order of our church," continued the men.

They explained that one presbytery, by a divided vote, received into membership a minister from another denomination who, upon examination before the presbytery, is alleged to have denied the deity of Jesus Christ. His reception into that presbytery has been appealed, and is in what is known as a "judicial process."

**THE LETTER THEN** said: "Because of this fact, the stated clerk advised the assembly that it would be inappropriate,

based on Section 88.19 of church law, for the assembly to take an action which might be considered as an interference in the case.

"This advice was given with the knowledge that the creeds of the church which affirm the deity of Jesus Christ were not in question. They are still in place. Such an affirmation, while consistent with the will of the general assembly, would best take place at a later date, so as not to in any way jeopardize a 'fair hearing' in the judicial process.

"The withdrawing congregations have chosen to seize upon this ruling and read into it far more than was actually there. This is a misrepresentation of facts.

"At no time has the United Presbyterian Church equivocated its faith in Jesus Christ as a son of God, as a part of the Trinity, and as lord and savior of us all. Let us covenant together to stand fast in that proclamation and expression of hope which it brings to all of us."

The statement concluded by saying that "The actions of the congregations of Ward United, Livonia, and First Church, Trenton, are disruptive to the life of the church of Jesus Christ at this time."

It added: "We urge each of you to correct the error in public information."



# Back from work in torrid Texas

Fixing up homes damaged by last year's tornado in Wichita Falls, Tex. was no picnic during the recent heat wave in Texas. But 29 members of the senior high school group at Redford Baptist Church in Redford Township did it.

Accompanied by four adults from the church, they were involved in a work camp project from June 22-28.

They found themselves sometimes in filthy surroundings meeting dispirited adults, some of whom were disabled and unable to look after their homes.

Was it really as hot as it seemed? Rick Range, a member of the youth group, said that on the day they placed a candy thermometer on the sidewalk, it recorded a temperature of 137 degrees. "And that wasn't even the hottest part of the day," said Rick.

"Some of those who worked in that

heat sometimes felt sick," stated Rev. James Kent, pastor of the church and a member of the group. "They worked hard, and did a good job. We left the high school where we were housed at 7 a.m. and returned at 2:30 p.m. Luckily the school was airconditioned.

"ONE OF OUR crews worked at the home of a poor, blind, diabetic. We made him a concrete walk to his trash cans. My crew worked for a little old lady who lived on the poverty level. She had lost her steel shed in the tornado. We used pieces of the shed to patch the roof. We painted her house.

"She always wanted a white house with green trim. As we were leaving I noticed she walked around the house four times to look at it."

She told the group: "Wait till my family and neighbors see it. They won't believe it."

The pastor pointed out that most of the people they helped were poor. "The damage from the tornado seemed to snap something in their minds, and they stopped taking care of their home," he said. "They became helpless. They had actually given up. Some houses we dug out were literally knee-deep in refuse. They smelled. Our kids had never experienced anything like that. We tried to prepare them for this situation, to help them shock-proof themselves, so they wouldn't walk in and gag at what they saw.

"Some said later they were repulsed, but they got themselves together and got to work."

**RICK RANGE** had been somewhat prepared by a work camp trip the previous year to Appalachia, where he had met poverty head on.

"I feel fortunate I can go out and do things like this," he explained. "I feel

fortunate I live in a place I like. If I want to change it around I can. We fixed the house of lady who had broken her knees. Her son had been in a car accident and had brain damage. We painted a room for her that hadn't been painted in seven years. We plastered the cracks in her walls. She really appreciated it."

He found in the case of one woman, it was not having part of the house blown away by the tornado that troubled her so much as the loss of things she valued.

"The lady we worked with lost the whole back of her house, but it was her memories she missed," Rick said. "Her photo album was lost. It held pictures of her grandparents. An old mantelpiece grandfather's clock was also lost. All they found was the mainspring.

"The most tragic part is that the house can be rebuilt, but the other things are irreplaceable."

Range noted that some of the people they met regarded them simply as free laborers, but others appreciated the fact they cared enough to come out and do this kind of work.

"Some were thoughtful about the heat," he observed. "They would bring us out pitchers of iced tea."

He said he enjoyed the challenge of the work. For example, he had to learn how to hang a door. As he used a dull saw to cut into the oak door to reduce its size, friction caused the door to catch on fire. He blew out the flames and proceeded more carefully.

"I think we all had a real sense of accomplishment from the project," he concluded. "Most of those who went viewed it as a learning experience, a chance to get a wider outlook on life."

He'll also remember the lady who viewed their work on her house and said, "It's a dream come true."

When Peter Nero calls Tim Hoy and asks for Number 215, Hoy knows exactly what to do.

Number 215 happens to be one of the best nine-foot Steinway Grand pianos Tim Hoy handles. Nero always uses that one when he plays in Michigan. So when the call comes through for 215, it is tuned the way Nero wants it and shipped to the concert stage where Nero will perform.

Hoy, sales manager and head of the concert and artist division for Hammell Music Co., also gets calls from other famous pianists who come to Michigan for a concert. Hoy deals with pianists like Magda Tagliaferro, Flavio Varani, Mischa Kottler, Ramsey Lewis, Andre Watts and Rudolf Serkin.

Hammell, on Middlebelt in Livonia, has an exclusive franchise in Michigan to lease and sell the world famous Steinway pianos. While the company has been in business some 33 years, it has had the agreement with Steinway only two years.

Licensed to sell Steinways, the piano that has come to be preferred by 95 percent of the world's concert artists, Hammell's concert grands are for exclusive use of professional pianist who perform in Michigan.

"Each piano in the concert and artist division is numbered," Hoy said recently as he stood among the Steinway grand in the small warehouse where those pianos are stored. "And an artist, after his initial pick of the piano he wants, can have it tuned by one of our technicians to his exact specifications."

WHEN THE ARTIST himself comes in to choose the right piano for the particular concert or type of music to be played, he is usually left alone with the pianos to make his own selection. Sometimes, however, Hoy runs into special problems.

"Last year, we had two classical pianists in town to give concerts on the same night. Both selected the exact same Steinway. We didn't know what to do," Hoy said.

"Fortunately, one was a man and the other a woman and the gentlemen gave way to the lady. The gentleman took another Steinway."

To the audiences of those two pianists, no difference perhaps would have been heard if each had selected a different Steinway grand. But to the artist, it makes a big difference.

"Pianos are funny," said Hoy, a pianist him-

self. "Like people, they have their own personalities."

"Take this one," he said, running his hands over the deep smooth finish of a black nine-foot grand. "This one is a dignified, graceful lady. She has class."

"You can hear the difference in tone. The bigger one of these Steinways is, the more the sound is changed. Each piano is unique."

HOY ALSO assists customers in the purchase of a Steinway for their home.

"There is no such thing as the typical Steinway buyer. They are a diversified clientele. Sometimes a bit wealthier than the average person, but this is not always true," Hoy said.

"We frequently see the fine musician who is interested in purchasing the best possible instrument for their money. Then, sometimes we also sell to the man who has saved his money for years and years just to buy a Steinway for his very own."

Hoy has worked for Hammell's for 12 years.

way that he has sold as one of his "babies" that needs looking after for some time.

IF YOU ARE shopping for a Steinway, however, the price is not cheap. The vertical or console Steinways retail for up to \$5,600, while concert grands go for between \$9,880 and \$22,800. Tim Hoy said that because of the price, a Steinway "will be one of the largest and most personal decisions many people will ever make."

While original prices are high, their price as a used instrument may even be higher. In New York City recently, a Steinway sold for \$390,000, the highest price ever paid for a piece of Victorian furniture. Steinways, which are still hand-crafted, have a history that goes back to the first Steinway made in 1836 in Seesen, Germany.

For many people, Tim Hoy said, owning a Steinway piano is the culmination of a life-long dream.

"To sell a Steinway to someone who has always wanted a Steinway," he added, "is what is fulfilling."

His fondness for pianos tells in his touch and his conversation about pianos. He said that once the "piano bug" bit him, he was done for. "You then eat and sleep pianos," he said.

The loving and reverent feeling for Steinway pianos is reflected in how he sells one of the pianos to a customer. "I never deliver a Steinway without seeing the home first," he said.

Doing that, he explained, can tell a lot about where the piano is going and if it is going to be take care of properly. He considers each Stein-

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
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**MORE FROM THE ANNUAL WORLD AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP PLIMPTON CUP TOURNAMENT**

Having observed the entire 19-point finals match between Russell Sands of Los Angeles and Wayne Drogseth of Las Vegas, there were several games and positions of great interest.

When playing tournament match play, you need to consider each game on its own merit. When a game is going your way, capitalize on it — turn the cube, especially if you are behind. The doubling cube becomes a very important tool. Too often, I've seen players wait too long to turn the cube.

In the example, black is on roll. Should black double? Should white accept?

Drogseth, black, did not double and rolled a 3-2. His timing being much better than white's, Drogseth moved both checkers from the 12 point.

Sands, white, has an 8-1 lead in the 19-point finals match. Black should have doubled and white should have passed. Why?

Barring double fives and fours, there is no way white will get safely past black on the 7 point. To avoid the inevitable, white would have passed, assuring black of a one-point win.

White soon rolled a 2-6. Black rolled a six to hit white then doubled the cube after white did not leave the bar. White then resigned the cube and game, taking a one-point loss and making the score 8-2.

What if black would have missed? Then he would have had no double and no game. This is why he should have doubled two rolls earlier, before the hit came along.

Another good opportunity to double the cube would have been when black had the direct six shot. The pressure exerted on white at that moment would have forced him out.

Black was fortunate to hit. But had he missed white, he would have lost the game when perhaps he would have won without testing his luck.

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
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
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# Energy board killed; syn fuels get OK

## HOUSE

**ENERGY BOARD:** The House voted 232-131 to table and thus kill the Energy Mobilization Board proposed as a key element of the administration's program for energy independence. To hasten the building of projects such as refineries and synthetic fuel plants, the "fast track" board could have triggered the waiver of federal and state laws and regulations impeding construction. The vote came during debate on S 1308.

Rep. Thomas Evans, R-Del., a supporter of tabling the bill, said the legislation "tosses in the governmental waste basket 200 years of state and local decision making."

Rep. Thomas Foley, D-Wash., an opponent of tabling, said today's laws "effectively sabotage our own plans to achieve energy independence by uncoordinated and time-consuming regulation."

Members voting "yea" wanted to block creation of the Energy Mobilization Board.

Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, David Bonior, D-Mt. Clemens, and Broomfield, R-Birmingham, voted "yea." Reps. William Ford, D-Taylor, William Brodhead, D-Detroit, and James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge, voted "nay."

**SYNTHETIC FUEL:** By a vote of 317-93, the House passed and sent to President Carter a bill aimed at developing a massive synthetic fuels industry in the U.S. Spending \$20 billion in the next fiscal year, \$88 billion over the next 12 years, the U.S. Synthetic Fuels Corp. will use loan guarantees, price guarantees and other mechanisms to prompt the private sector to develop the virgin technology.

Synthetic fuel is chiefly oil from shale and gas from coal. The goal of the legislation is to yield two million barrels of "synfuels" daily by 1992; the U.S. now imports 7.2 billion barrels of oil and oil products daily.

Supporter Chalmers Wylie, R-Ohio, said he liked the bill's "emphasis on coal, our ace in the hole," and added that failure to pass the bill "would mean another headstone in the graveyard of dead energy projects and an even more vulnerable America."

Opponent Ted Weiss, D-N.Y., said the bill "plunges headlong into an unproven technology... by spending vast sums that will likely fill the coffers of

the same companies (that) benefited royally from the windfall profits of oil decontrol."

Members voting "yea" wanted to launch the government-funded attempt to develop a synthetic fuels industry in the U.S. Pursell, Bonior, Ford, Brodhead, Blanchard and Broomfield, voted "yea."

**STATE DEPT:** The House adopted, 240-144, an amendment cutting five percent (\$78.3 million) from the State Department's fiscal 1981 budget. Only funding for the American Institute in Taiwan was exempted from the cut. The vote came during debate on an appropriations bill headed for passage and the Senate.

Supporter John Ashbrook, R-Ohio, said: "It has always been hard for the Congress to say no to the special interests and the bureaucratic empires which seek ever more funds from the public trough. It is now time to say yes to the taxpayer."

Opponent Neal Smith, D-Iowa, said that in the wake of Iran the budget contains more money for security at embassies, and that approval of this amendment would lessen security overseas. Members voting "yea" favored the State Department budget cut.

Pursell, and Broomfield, voted "yea."

Bonior, Brodhead and Blanchard voted "nay."

Ford did not vote.

## SENATE

**TAX CUT:** On an essentially party-line vote of 52-33, the Senate killed a GOP-drafted ten percent across-the-board cut in individual income tax rates. The cut was to have been accompanied by faster depreciation rates for plants and equipment. The vote came during debate on HR 7477, an airport taxation bill that was passed and sent to the White House.

Sen. Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., a supporter of killing the plan, said "this is the Reagan amendment, the Reagan trickle-down, make-the-rich-richer amendment."

Riegle and Levin voted "nay."

**REVENUE SHARING:** By a vote of 36-55, the Senate failed to sustain a \$572 million cut in fiscal 1980 revenue sharing outlays to state governments. Thus the \$572 million expenditure was approved. The vote came during debate on an appropriations bill later passed and sent to conference with the House.

Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., who supported the cut, said "it makes little sense for the federal government, which is still in a deficit position, to provide revenue sharing to the states, a majority of which are running substantial surpluses."

Sen. Lowell Weicker, R-Conn., an opponent, said: "Our economy has gone into a deep recession which has created financial hardships for most state and local governments." Senators voting "yea" wanted to reduce federal revenue sharing with the states by \$572 million this year.

Riegle and Levin voted "nay."

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
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# Convention is for TV

It could not be said more clearly. The 1980 Republican convention in Detroit is not a convention. Ken Rietz, convention planner, said the convention isn't just being shown on TV; it's being made for TV.

In fact, "The whole idea is to make the event into a TV production instead of a convention." He also was quoted in a newspaper article as saying that "our own delegates are not the people we should be talking to. We want the TV audience."

And so Rietz has planned a TV production that will give us actor Chad Everett, singer Wayne Newton and ice skater Dorothy Hamill during prime time (10-11 p.m.) and House Minority Leader John Rhodes during the doldrum hour, 6 p.m.

Actor Jimmy Stewart, race car driver Richard Petty and hockey player Gordie Howe are also joining in the festivities.

And since videotapes of the 1976 convention showed people drifting away from speakers after the first five-eight minutes, Rietz is urging all but the most important to stop after eight minutes.

**BUT THERE** is more. A brightly lit convention hall would tend to diffuse the attention Rietz is carefully manipulating, so speakers and performers will be illuminated with spotlights.

This would cover up delegates who might be dozing or absent.

A black family rock group called The Whitney's is supposed to repeat the impact Rietz created in 1972 when he arranged for Sammy Davis Jr. to perform and to embrace Nixon before live TV cameras.

"I think a black family performing on the convention stage is going to have more impact on the audience at home than a speech."

And don't be surprised if the spontaneous applause after the National Anthem is only scheduled for 10 seconds. They decided that was long enough for the 1972 convention where they learned many of the techniques they want to use in Detroit this year.

My first reaction to this incredible mixture of banality and blatant manipulation was to think that the public gets when the public wants. But that's not really true, because in this case the public gets only what some people believe the public wants.

And that set the stage for my second reaction, which is one of frustration and extreme disappointment.

AS A CONCERNED citizen, I hoped for a full and open discussion of the policies that the Republicans would present to implement the rights and responsibilities outlined in our Constitution.

To listen to the delegates from the states debate on issues of national and foreign policies was to open up a larger perspective of what this nation might do and need.

And I had even entertained the dream that an open discussion and review of some issues might create some new perspectives and policies.

Considering the different issues raised by our political candidates, it did not seem completely unrealistic.

Convention planner Rietz has anticipated this kind of reaction, "but that's not important," he figured. "What's important is what the reviewer at home thinks."

It's like getting a bad review for a film: If it's great box office, who cares about the reviewers?

I had planned to watch the TV coverage of the convention but not any more.

I'm going to look for the movie "Gone With the Wind," and add my vote to its box office. At least the heading on the marquee is correct.

## Groups favor community placement

Two of Michigan's Protestant denominations recently made a significant first step toward the community placement goal of the state Department of Mental Health.

The Michigan Synod, Lutheran Church in America and the Detroit Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church both passed resolutions in support of placing the handicapped in community homes.

Speaking of the rights of handicapped persons, the churches stated that all people, regardless of the severity of their disability, have the right, and are entitled to live in the community and be recipients of, and contribute to community life.

Recognizing that it is not just enough to affirm the rights of handicapped persons, both denominations called on their congregations to grow in their own understandings of handicapping conditions. They asked their members to be advocates for the mentally and physically handicapped, to increase public awareness of their problems, and to serve as catalysts to bring about positive attitudes within their own communities.

The United Methodist resolution also called for the establishment of an annual conference-level ministry for persons with handicapping conditions. To be set up under the Conference Council on Ministry, the ministry will provide assistance to congregations "in their role and responsibility as ministers, educators, advocates, and catalysts for change within their local communities."

Under the direction of the Rev. Gary Wheeler, the Michigan Synod, Lutheran Church in America, is already a participant in such a ministry. As part of Lutheran Social Services of Michigan, the division of services among the developmentally disabled seeks to minister among handicapped persons by developing and operating community homes for developmentally disabled persons. It aims to develop the community based support services which these persons require, as well as advocating on behalf of the developmentally disabled wherever such advocacy is necessary.

The draft resolution was written by Carol Park, community relations director at Northville Residential Training Center, and Peter Schweitzer, community relations director at Plymouth Center for Human Development. Schweitzer is an ordained United Methodist minister and Park is in the process of preparing for ordination in the United Methodist Church.

With the help of pastor Wheeler and the Rev. David Strang of the St. Philips Lutheran Church in Ypsilanti, the resolution was refined to the form in which it was prepared for consideration.

Although changes in wording were made by both denominations, the intent of the resolution remained the same.

In the semifinals, Ashare, the No. 8 seed, fell to Gilles, 6-4, 6-2.



Michalik, who pitched all five innings, gained credit for the win. He struck out seven.


He received heavy offensive support from Todd Riedel, who went 2-for-2, including a homer, and Hartnett, who added two hits.

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

DiPonio suffered its third straight defeat of the season Saturday, bowing to Westland, 8-2.

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

"Now, it's getting to the point where every team wants to beat the Wolves," Mancini said of his team's unbeaten status. "Every team is trying hard."

### in the pocket W.W. Edgar

Of all the sports and recreational activities, bowling is the only one that owes its popularity and success to a single piece of equipment.

While it is the second oldest sport known to man and dates back to 5200 B.C., bowling was doomed in the early 1940's when the lack of pinsetters caused many of the area establishments and other places across the country to consider closing.

Then, an old gent named Charlie Schmidt, a resident of the mountains in New York state uncovered his latest invention — the automatic pinsetter — and the game was saved.

The coming of the pinsetter was one of the best guarded secrets of all sports in that the first machines were built under lock and key on the seventh floor of a machine shop in Brooklyn, N.Y. It was unveiled to the public for the first time at the American Bowling Congress convention at Buffalo in 1946.

Long before that, there were several automatic machines, but they didn't meet the ABC requirement that the pins had to be reset on the spots on which they were left standing on spares. Schmidt's machine was the first to reset the pins where it found them.

One of the most interesting features of the new machine was how it separated the pins from the ball in the pit before resetting them.

To old Charlie Schmidt this was a simple matter. He had the pits concaved with two strips of wood several inches wide reaching from side to side.

They were kept far enough apart to allow pins to fall through, but not the ball. When the ball hit, it set in a motion a motor that raised the two boards to the height of the lane and then tipped the ball off to the ball return.

Since then the underground return has come on the market and the bowler doesn't see the ball until it pops out of the return at the bowlers' bench.

The first automatic pinsetters in America were installed at the Bowl-o-Drome in Mt. Clemens, and for a year there was a steady stream of proprietors making a trip there from all parts of the country to see the saviour of the game in action.

MARGE MERRICK, now a resident of Columbus, Ohio, who recently was honored with a place in the WIBC Hall of Fame, once bowled in the Detroit women's all-star leagues.

In fact she was named the city's Bowling Queen on four occasions and she bowled out of the old Maple Lanes in Dearborn.

ANSWERING THE MAIL: The late Harold Allen, proprietor of the now defunct Palace Recreation, has an unusual place in bowling history. Bowling with his brother, Ray, he helped win the ABC doubles when he was only 16 years old.

But that is not his most unusual feat. He once bowled a 299 1/2 score.

How did this come about? After rolling 11 atries in a row he had a solid hit on his 12th ball but the No. 10 pin split down the middle and one half of it was left standing.

In no way could he be credited with a perfect game. The shot still is one of bowling's great oddities.

THE BOWLING proprietors of Michigan are expecting one of the largest turnouts in years when they gather for the annual state convention at Traverse City this month.

George Prybyla, general manager and part owner of Thunderbowl, will end his tenure as president when he presides over the major sessions.



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
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## Livonia League foiled in 9th
