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## Winds blow away \$5 million in 'disaster'

Estimates of damage in Canton Township from last week's wind storm now top \$5 million and may go as high as \$6 million, according to Supervisor Noel Culbert. Earlier estimates had

placed damage at about \$1 million.

And the damage figures provided by Culbert don't include crop losses.

As the cleanup and property damage appraisals continued, Gov. William Milliken Monday declared Wayne and Washtenaw counties disaster areas.

Hard-hit communities will be eligible for assistance.

Police Chief Jerry Cox, the emergency preparedness coordinator for the township, who had surveyed the damage from a helicopter, noted particularly what had happened to crops.

Cox said he saw "hundreds of acres of corn lying flat to the ground." He said most of the damaged farms were west of Canton Center Road.

Dianne Neihengen — a member of the Canton planning commission and the farmland preservation committee — said barns and portions of storage sheds had also been destroyed.

Fruit trees were toppled by high winds and portions of crops had been blown away or crushed, she added.

"The problem they (farmers) are having is that they don't have water," said Ms. Neihengen, who had volunteered to get in touch with farmers. "Their pumps are powered by electricity. They are really in trouble."

(As of Tuesday afternoon, about 1,700 homes in Canton Township remained without electricity, according to a Detroit Edison spokesman. Service was expected to be restored by Friday.)

Complicating the problem is that the farmers haven't really joined in a cooperative effort as have the homeowners' associations.

"They (farmers) are extremely independent," continued Ms. Neihengen. "I don't think all of them are aware of available aid. I can see a need for a farmers' association."

Canton grants coordinator Terry Carroll said the state disaster plan calls for crop damage to be verified by a state-certified assessor. Damage assessment would be based on the fair market value of the crops, he added.

"I DOUBT if we'll have to do any crop assessment," said Carroll. "Rather than taking their chances with the government, they probably would opt to harvest now."

"Private insurance will cover a lot of loss on single family homes," he continued. "We would like to look at what (aid) is available for businesses."

"We've asked for federal disaster assistance," said Lt. Gene Conley of the emergency services division of the Michigan State Police. The division is coordinating the state-wide plan from Lansing.

"There are also state and federal teams verifying (damage)," he added. "Just because we ask doesn't mean we get it. The problem is we're trying to boil down a multitude of programs that may apply."

Conley explained that there are a number of state and federal disaster or emergency funding plans, and communities must be able to document a need. Some forms of aid reimburse the community for cleanup.

Others would include loans and grants through the federal Small Business Administration.

CANTON SUPERVISOR Noel Cul-

bert last week asked homeowners' associations to list damage to roofs, windows, trees and buildings. A partially-constructed apartment building off I-275 and Cherry Hill was destroyed, and several mobile homes were ripped off their foundations by high winds.

For days after last Wednesday's storm, most of Canton — as well as most of western Wayne County and portions of Washtenaw County — lacked electricity and telephone service. Trees were toppled, garages and sheds destroyed and portions of buildings blown away during the short-lived storm.

While the assessment continued, volunteers from the Civil Air Patrol, the Salvation Army and the Red Cross logged thousands of hours helping out.

Red Cross workers cooked up big batches of chili and goulash and had them delivered to senior citizens living on Warren Road at Royal Holiday mobile home park, which still remained without power almost a week after the storm.

Civil Air Patrol volunteers canvassed neighborhoods and knocked on doors to make sure people were all right.

Other volunteers, and township employees, helped residents store perishable meats in trucks and boxcars which supermarket chains had donated.

Earlier, the township had distributed free dry ice to residents. However, that proved too costly and time consuming to drive to Flint, Grand Rapids and Lansing for available ice.

## Arson suspected

## High school student dies in fire

Local investigators are looking into the death of a ninth grader from Plymouth-Saler: High who they believe may have started the fire that claimed his life Sunday evening.

The body of Larry Sumner, 15, was found in a secluded loft above a workroom adjacent to his family's living quarters in the Mayflower Townhouse complex, 400 N. Main Street, Plymouth.

Firefighters, who rescued Sumner's 18-month-old nephew from an untouched bedroom in the home, say they were unaware of Sumner's presence there until the burning home was almost extinguished.

It was difficult in the early stages of the investigation to determine whether the youth's death was the result of a suicide attempt, homicide or an accident, according to Lt. Henry Berghoff of the Plymouth Police.

However, the third possibility was discounted Tuesday by Fire Chief Roy Hall who confirmed the fire was purposely set. Although lab testing results were not available by press time, he believes either gasoline or paint thinner was used to start the fire.

Wayne County medical examiners determined that Sumner died of smoke inhalation.

He lived at the complex in a joint apartment-maintenance garage with his mother, Nita, and his father, Edward, the complex's maintenance supervisor.

MR. AND MRS. SUMNER had left the home Sunday at 5:30 p.m. to attend a bingo game, leaving Larry in charge of his sister's children, Dennis Lee Cooper Jr., 18 months, and Shanny, 4.

When the fire broke out, only Larry and Dennis were in the dwelling. Shanny Cooper had been playing outside.

The first two firefighters to arrive on the scene, Al Matthews and Don Belsky, said their original attempt to enter the home through the garage was thwarted by intense heat, fire and smoke.

"Fire completely involved the garage area and the kitchen just north of the garage door," said Capt. Belsky.

Hall added that several explosions accounted for the "rapid expansion" of the fire in that area.

"We didn't even know there was a loft," said Belsky. "The body was really found at the end of the fire. The place was hot, humid and completely filled by smoke."

Meanwhile, as additional help arrived to extinguish the blaze, Matthews and several other firefighters began entering the living quarters of the

building where they found the infant cowering against a far wall in the bedroom.

"The door to the bedroom was closed which is really the only thing that saved his life because the build-up of heat and smoke was so intense," said Matthews.

THE INFANT, carried out along with a kitten, was taken to St. Mary Hospital and treated for smoke inhalation.

"Even at that point we had no indication that anyone else was in the building," said Matthews. "My first impression was..."

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## Treasurer, supervisor hopefuls face issues

Maria Falkiewicz — Canton's deputy treasurer for the last 1½ years — has launched her second campaign for an elected treasurer job.

But Mrs. Falkiewicz, 33, does not view herself as a politician.

She criticizes any public official who makes decisions on the basis of how many votes they will lose or reap.

"When I hear officials say they should act in a certain way because the press or people would love it, it infuriates me inside," Mrs. Falkiewicz said.

"You don't want to get to the point where you can't function anymore. I've tried very hard not to use political pressures."

A CANTON RESIDENT for the last seven years, Mrs. Falkiewicz is one of three Democrats seeking the treasurer's nomination. Two Republicans will battle it out Aug. 5 for their party's nomination.

Mrs. Falkiewicz staged an unsuccessful campaign for the treasurer's job in 1978.

Shortly after the election, she won a deputy treasurer appointment from her opponent — Republican James Donahue. She officially assumed the administrative aspects of

the treasurer's job last March due to Donahue's illness.

During her tenure as deputy, Mrs. Falkiewicz initiated an investment program that earned \$1.5 million in interest last year.

"We keep our balance down to absolute zero in our savings accounts," she said. Tax money and various funds are invested in short-term repurchase agreements.

Noel Culbert says things have calmed down during his administration.

"A lot of people have commented to me that we don't have the controversies we used to," said Canton's incumbent supervisor. "I think it's fair to say the township has settled down."

"We're not responding to crises anymore. We're managing them."

Culbert, 33, is seeking his second term as the township's chief administrator.

A Democrat, he will compete with three other candidates — including two past supervisors — for his party's nomination Aug. 5. One Republican also is vying for the position.

This is Culbert's third election campaign. He won the supervisor's position in 1978 following an unsuccessful bid for a trustee slot in 1976.

"I came in last place — I mean really last place," Culbert said of the 1976 primary. "It was no contest."

CULBERT MAINTAINS that many of Canton's past political issues are dead and says it's time "to get down to basic government."

He views the need for industrial development as the top issue of this election. Many residents, who

balked at industrial development before, "now realize a need," he said.

Culbert has proposed the creation of an industrial coordinator position and says "the time is right for a super massive industrial growth campaign."

"If I had to concentrate on one thing, this is it. It's easy to say, 'Bring industry to Canton.' But you have to do something about it. We're

John Barnette thinks "politician" is a dirty word.

Barnette, 33, is a Democratic candidate for township supervisor. He is a partner in John and Dude Towing on Canton Center Road, and if elected, would be "for the people and the businessmen — not for the politicians."

Originally from West Virginia, and formerly of Westland, he has lived in Canton since October 1979.


When Barnette moved his business from Westland to Canton three years ago, he thought it would be "a better place to live and work." Now he contends that the township is suffering from "poor management and poor leadership."

"IN THE past two years, I have seen (the township) go downhill — I mean strictly downhill," said Barnette.

For example, he believes that he, as well as other small business people, have been "pushed around" by the township board.

Barnette's business handles vehicle towing and storage service for the township. Barnette has been upset lately as the township board considers setting up a vehicle pound operated by the police department.

Some officials say a township-op-

erated pound would generate revenues.

"I felt how it is," said Barnette. "I was at the bottom of the list. That's what possessed me to run (for office)."

"As a small business owner I have worked hard," he added. "If they (officials) don't have ways of earning their own (revenues) they don't need to be in the office."

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

## Protest marks war challenge

The start of peacetime draft registration nationwide was brought home to Plymouth early this week with a "steady" turnout at the Penniman Ave. Post Office.

While some 100 19- and 20-year-old males registered there Monday, those opposed to that order were rallying their forces.

On Monday, the start of the two-week national registration process, a local peace group was planning to bring its messages to Kellogg Park for an evening rally.

It was organized by about 30 people, mostly students from the Plymouth-Canton community, who recently formed their chapter of the national Committee Against Registration and the Draft (CARD).

The national committee is a coalition of about 50 separate groups, including womens, students, religious, civil rights and political organizations.

Among those urging an anti-war, anti-draft stance was a laid-off tool and die maker from Plymouth Township, Don Calvin.

"There are three things you can count on in this life, the dawn will follow the dusk, the draft will follow the registration and the burying of our dead youth will follow the draft," he told the audience of approximately 100-250.

"I think the reason the young people asked me to speak is that they don't want to give the impression that you have to be in high school to belong to the Plymouth-Canton CARD.

"I have already decided for myself that I cannot sit idly and watch the economists grow fat at the expense of this country's youth."

Another speaker, Bill Roundtree, a Vietnam veteran and organizer for the American Servicemen's Union, said op-

posing the draft and registration is not enough.

"The blacks and oppressed youths are the first ones to be called up. Opposition to the draft is not just one issue — it's important to the question of racism."

The rally had attracted not only the youth of this area but also a splattering of those in their middle ages as well as residents of Detroit and various Oakland County communities.

Pat and Chuck Dawson of Plymouth, parents of a draft-age son, said they attended the rally because they "don't agree" with registration.

"I don't think the government should be taking my son to register for the draft," said Mrs. Dawson. "My son-in-law was taken away from my daughter and grandson to get involved in Vietnam. Now my son is facing it and my grandson will in another 10 years. Is that what we're raising them for — war?"

Meanwhile, a 1979 Plymouth Canton high graduate, Robert Tangway, who will register next week, had these thoughts.

"I don't like it, I don't agree with it. But I've got to say it's something that's too big for my hands to change. Considering how fast the world is changing, I would say a war is coming up."

While some of the group's organizers said they were "disappointed" in the turnout, others, such as Centennial Educational Park graduate Cheryl Pijanowski, were encouraged by the show of "new faces" from Plymouth and other areas.

They said they planned to continue leafletting their anti-draft material at the post office during the two-week period.



Monday's rally continued with a procession down Main Street.





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# Deputy campaigns for slot as treasurer

Previously, only money that would be available for months was invested, Mrs. Falkiewicz said. Now, virtually all money not needed immediately is invested.

Those earlier programs earned about \$100,000 in interest each year, she said. As deputy, Mrs. Falkiewicz also initiated a new policy on purchasing "which gives us better control." She established procedures for issuing liquor licenses.

On occasion, Mrs. Falkiewicz has sat on the Township Board with fulling voting power in the absence of Donahue.

LEGISLATIVE ASPECTS of the treasurer's job are as important as administrative duties, she said.

"You have such a diversified position, you sometimes have to be two people," said Mrs. Falkiewicz. "The administrative duties are important. But the other important thing is that you're a public official."

She sees a need to attract more industry to Canton as vitally important.

The Township Board should research the possibility of hiring an industrial coordinator, Mrs. Falkiewicz said. Tax incentives should be given to only certain kinds of industry. Campaigns

should not be aimed toward automotive-related industries.

"We have to determine what kind of development we want and where. We have three school districts here. If we plan for development in the south end, we're not helping the Plymouth-Canton Schools," she said.

She recognizes a need for more recreational facilities in the township.

"I'd like to see some type of multipurpose building," she said. "But we always have to remember our taxes."

Township officials should seek federal grants for capital improvements in the recreational area, said Mrs. Falkiewicz. But the costs of operating new recreational buildings or programs should be considered.

MRS. FALKIEWICZ praises the efforts of township employees to help residents in the aftermath of last week's storm.

But she said improvements are needed in the township's emergency preparedness program. Specific duties of each township official and department head should be contained in a policy.

"Professionalism" is lacking in township government, she said.

"How do we respond to these people who appear before the board? Do we

really listen to what they're saying? Do we give them answers?"

She said staff members are sometimes "ridiculed publicly" at Township Board meetings.

"If board members disagree (with their recommendations), fine," Mrs. Falkiewicz said. "But there's no reason for (ridicule)."

She favors the establishment of a committee with members from all special interest groups. The committee should meet regularly with the Township Board or administrators, she said.

"We have to meet with people to see what their needs are. This way you're showing that you're really interested in what their problems are."

MRS. FALKIEWICZ announced her resignation from the deputy treasurer job last January during Donahue's illness. She later changed her mind about leaving.

At the time, she was performing many of the treasurer's duties. She

worked 50-60 hours a week for a part-time pay of \$135, she said. The deputy job was made a fulltime, \$18,000-a-year position in March.

"Things weren't getting done at all the way they should," she said of the reasons behind her resignation announcement. "People had to realize what the problems were, but Jim

(Donahue) was the only one who could make those decisions. I just couldn't be a part of what was going on at the time."

Mrs. Falkiewicz said she hated to leave projects she had already begun. She gave the same reasons for seeking the treasurer's nomination Aug. 5.

Mrs. Falkiewicz has taken numerous

budgeting, accounting and cash management courses from Eastern Michigan University, Michigan State University and Michigan Township Association offerings.

Before joining the township staff, she held several positions with Ford Motor Co. and supervisory positions with trucking firms.

## Barnette favors recreation

BARNETTE BELIEVES the township needs to improve its tax base by recruiting more business and industry. He praised the township merit commission, which hires department heads.

He said the merit commission's hiring plan helps avoid hiring of people who are "in the clique" or who have ties to township officials.

On farmland preservation issue, Bar-

nette believes the farmer should decide if he wants to sell his property or to continue farming.

"That's their land, and we should let the people decide," said Barnette. "Farmers aren't really growing crops. You look west of us — to Chelsea, Manchester and Jackson — that's farming."

"We're far from being the real (food) suppliers," he added. "If the country was depending on us, they would starve."

Barnette would like to see more recreation for both adults and children. Service fees or membership in a recreational facility could be a source of revenue, he added.

"I would like to see something under one roof, a quarter of a mile square with tennis courts, a swimming pool and gym," said Barnette. "Instead of paying out money — wasting money — there is money to be made."

"My God, there's a baby there." Sumner was discovered some 40 minutes after the original response when firefighters entered the loft to break open the roof to release some heat.

A resident of the complex, Rory Steele, 16, said he was the first person to notice the blaze.

"I heard a few things popping in the garage, and saw the flames coming through the back door. Then I heard the screams."

Running to the back of the building, he attempted to crash in a door, using a lawn mower.

"Oh, it was boiling. The (door) handle was really hot. When I hit the door, there was an explosion and me and the kitchen window went out at the same time."

"It happened like lighting off a book of matches."

RICHARD LANSI, of Canton, followed Steele to the burning building.

"I just stood right there at the back door. I knew once I heard that yell there was no hope. We knew he was in there as soon as I saw his bike. He takes it wherever he goes."

According to Bergoff, police believe Sumner climbed to the loft after failing to escape the fire on the main floor of the building.

Responding to the fire were 17 full-

time and volunteer firefighters. Only two full-time men were on duty at the time of the fire.

It's believed that some of the volunteer firefighters were delayed in reaching the fire when a train blocked access at Main Street near Theodore.

"I don't think the train would have made a difference in saving a life," said Hall.

He added the train did not delay the second fire engine which arrived three minutes after the first crew.

Three firefighters were injured that night. Treated for burns and smoke inhalation were Belsky, Paul Pavloff and Dan Fowler. All were treated and released that evening.

According to Jim Shupe, 13, son of the complex's president, Sumner had moved to Plymouth with his family about 11 months ago from Saranac, Mich.

He had no close friends in the complex but was active in organizing team sports with the youngsters there.

On Saturday Sumner had spent the day painting playground equipment in the complex.

"He used to try to get people to play volleyball and baseball," said Lansy. "He once got his dad to take five or six of the kids here to a Tiger game, the first one after they opened the bleachers."

"Most of the people said he goes up there to the loft to think a lot," said Shupe.

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

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
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# Culbert views term as 'calm'

at the point now that we can do something about it."

Culbert says an industrial coordinator is needed "if this thing is to be done professionally."

If re-elected, Culbert hopes to expand the township's recreational offerings.

He expresses worry, however, about the proposed Tisch tax cut and other propositions on the November ballot.

"The issue we'll all have to face if Tisch comes through is where the money will come from. You can't budget for money you don't have."

Culbert says the township's general fund cannot afford additional spending for recreation. He endorses the use of revenue-sharing funds — which he calls "frosting on the cake" — for recreational purposes.

He likes the idea of a community recreation center and advocates the purchase of more park land.

But the Township Board must consider operational and development costs before approving any

capital expenditures, he said.

AS FOR FARMLAND preservation, Culbert believes that implementation of a development rights program can wait.

"It has to be addressed. I'm not ignoring it," he said of a development rights program. "But the farmer isn't feeling development pressures right now.

"Right now, the farmer wants tax relief. The farmer wants to farm. He doesn't want to be told what to do with his land."

Culbert brushes off a criticism which surfaced early in his term regarding his administrative abilities.

"When I came on, four department heads had just been hired and there was a change in administrations. There were certainly adjustments that had to be made.

"That criticism came up over a year ago. Frankly, I haven't heard any criticisms since then."

Culbert, an attorney, is a five-year resident of Canton Township. He holds a law degree from the University of Detroit.

# W-W taps Higgs

Gerald Higgs, a Wayne resident, was selected by the Wayne-Westland school board, but not without some dissent.

Higgs will serve out the remainder of a four-year school board term, which expires next June. That board seat was vacated by Stephen Kelly, who accepted a position with the Garden City district one week after the school election in June.

Kelly had resigned, effective July 1, and the board had 20 days to appoint someone to the position.

Debate began over Higgs' appointment and continued over the method for selecting the new appointee. Trustee Fred Warmbier objected to the board casting ballots. He moved instead that David Moranty be appointed on the basis of the last election.

That move failed by a 4-2 vote, with Kenneth Marshall and Warmbier

voting in favor of Moranty.

Moranty was an unsuccessful candidate for the board, placing third behind Mildred Batterson and Mary Arbour, who won the two available seats.

On the first written ballot, Higgs was selected by a 4-2 vote.

Several district residents voiced displeasure with the appointment, one asking for some background information on Higgs.

Higgs described his community involvement and said his children had attended Wayne-Westland junior and senior high schools after leaving St. Mary school.

"I always thought I might like something like this, and this is an opportunity to do so on a short-term basis," Higgs said, adding that if people are unhappy with his appointment, they should organize campaigns now

to do something about it in the next election.

Before electing Higgs to the board, trustees had interviewed candidates in a public meeting. Only six people were in the audience, including a reporter and a school secretary.

Higgs, a life-long resident of Wayne, is a time analyst with the Wayne County Road Commission. He said he has been active as a coach and in helping with the Wayne summer festival, among other activities.

Higgs told the board he applied because he believed he could "lend stability" to the board.

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
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
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
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
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

## Beloved ice cream cone celebrates 76th year

During these humid days of an unusual summer, it is a common sight to see men, women and children line up at the ice cream parlors to obtain an ice cream cone.

But few of them who enjoy the cool delicious mound of ice cream, cuddled in a crunchy cone, realize that this is the 76th birthday of the delicacy — and that its birth still is couched in controversy.

According to the crisp yellow pages of history, the ice cream cone came into being in 1904 at the World's Fair in St. Louis, but from there on, the history is not clear.

Little is made of the birthday of the cone in 1904 as the world already had been seen the telephone, the airplane and the cotton gin that were considered much more important.

Most of the accounts agree that a nameless concessionaire, who was shouting about the goodness of the grid-dle cakes he was baking right on the midway, came up with the idea.

DURING A lull in business, he is supposed to have rolled one of his still-warm cakes into a cornucopia shape. The vendor in the next stall was selling ice cream, and the cake baker got an idea. Why not put a cake of ice cream in his cone? When he did that, the ice cream cone was born.

Unfortunately, so history tells us, neither man realized that he had contributed a great day to history. But two other employees at the fair were taken with the idea and when the fair closed they went back to Cincinnati and began an experiment.

They started manufacturing cones in a small way, but the new ice cream container caught the fancy of the public, and it wasn't long until cones appeared in other cities.

Automation got in on the new product in 1910 when a man named Frederick Brockman, in Portland, Ore., invented a machine that turned out 3,000 cones an hour. Cones became the rage

and in 1928, the Nabisco Co. came into the ice cream cone business.

The Nabisco Co. improved on the original by arranging for what was called a nesting ring around the top. This allowed the cones to be packed into each other for shipping. With this new idea, cones were now being shipped to all sections of the country without fear of breakage and the cones became one of America's favorites in hot, humid weather.

IT IS now claimed that Americans consume 786 million gallons of ice cream annually. Just imagine what it would be like if it all was dispensed in single-dip cones. It would come to 194 cones a year for each man, woman and child.

Yet, with it all, no one is certain on which day to sing "Happy Birthday." So, possibly, it should be sung all summer in honor of the two unknown vendors who made it possible at the 1904 World Fair in St. Louis.



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

With a smile librarian Thomas commented, "That's part of our work and we found what you wanted in the files of the Detroit Public Library. It was just another part of our service."

This type of service was unknown in what are referred to as "the good old days." If the poem couldn't be found in the local library, that was it. There was no further effort.

Another thing that has changed is the

manner of the clients when they approach the counter.

"Some of the women just want to come in and talk. And the men, too. It is a place for them to take a short respite from trudging around downtown."

"And we are always glad to welcome them for a short visit," librarian Thomas said.

While sitting there chatting, she recalled that she was attracted to library work when still a student in high school.

"The teacher and the librarian were always so cheerful and accommodating and seemingly relaxed," she said, "that I made up my mind that I would become a librarian. And here I am."

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
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
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

EACH CANDIDATE was asked issue questions and responded as follows:

**Q.** What are the major plans or problems associated with the present form of government in Wayne County that you would work to correct in writing a new charter?

**Wiegand:** Fragmentation of authority and responsibility. We need to have an administrator who is in charge, es-

pecially in the area of budget and finance.

**Wendover:** The largest problem facing Wayne County (and from which most other county woes stem) is the lack of clearly defined responsibility. A charter (with either the appointive or elective administrator form — and those forms should be widely varying) should pinpoint authority. Additionally, a well-written charter should facilitate the administration of county services without further fostering the imagined rivalry between Detroit and the out-county areas. A good charter will benefit us all fairly.

**Holland:** The major problems as I see them are: 1.) lack of centralized authority; 2.) failure to set priorities; 3.) inability to solve problems in an organized and efficient manner; 4.) lack of inter-departmental cooperation.

**Hink:** One of the major problems with the present form of Wayne County government is the absence of an execu-

tive branch with the authority to oversee the various county departments and agencies. In drafting a new county charter, I would advocate the creation of an elected countywide chief executive whose responsibility would be to oversee and control the various departments and agencies of county government. The various department and agency heads would be directly responsible to the county executive.

**Hammonds:** The major problem with the present form of government is its lack of cohesiveness. Having a county executive should correct some of this since all departments except those headed by elected officials will come under the authority of this individual. Another problem is overspending. Hopefully when a county executive is in office with veto power some of the excessive spending will be curtailed.

**Foley:** The major problems of Wayne County are that authority and responsibility are so widely diffused, that it is

frequently difficult or impossible to pinpoint responsibility for particular problems or functions. County government is fragmented and inefficient.

**Berg:** 1.) Financial planning and fiscal responsibility; 2.) Redefine the responsibilities of the road commission and the drain commission to have them be more responsive to the needs of the communities they serve.

**Q.** Do you support a "yes" or "no" vote on the Aug. 5 proposal to establish a charter commission? Give the reasons for your position and indicate whether you are publicly advocating that position.

**Holland:** I support a "yes" vote. The main reason why I support the charter commission is obvious to anyone who looks at Wayne County government — the old system has failed badly and a

new, workable system is needed if quality services are to be maintained.

**Wiegand:** I will publicly advocate a "no" vote Aug. 5 on the proposal to establish a charter commission. The present districts based upon the 1970 census figures are an insult to the fair principal of "one man-one vote." There has been an obvious shift in population within the county since 1970. I feel we should wait until the updated 1980 census figures are available so that the districts can be redrawn to reflect reality. Additionally, such an important proposal should appear on the ballot in an even-numbered year when the majority of municipalities within the county will be holding regular elections. I support the lawsuit recently filed and I hope the circuit court will issue a restraining order to prevent the clerk from placing any names on the ballot for charter commission posts.

**Berg:** Yes. Any movement toward reform is a forward movement.

**Wendover:** By all means, vote "yes" on Wayne County reorganization. I advocate that at every opportunity in my campaign and have asked my opponents to do so as well. (All my literature supports that stand.) It is distressing to see the lack of reorganization support from the out-county areas which seem to be losing the 1980 census basis drive. We need a new charter now. If the voters don't restructure county government, the courts will eventually do it.

**Foley:** I support a "yes" vote and I publicly advocate that position. I believe Wayne County must adopt a charter which provides for a county executive who has the authority to coordinate all administrative operations of county government and who is accountable for that. As presently structured there is overlap between executive and legislative functions and a lack of clear lines of authority and accountability.



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
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# County charter commission hopefuls give views

**Hammonds:** Yes, the county needs an executive to administrate and correlate the various departments, boards and commissions. In order to have a county executive it is necessary to have a charter with provisions and terms set. Whoever finally becomes executive would then have guidelines as to the limits and responsibilities of the position. Wayne County needs someone to take control and coordinate all the various functions to eliminate any duplication of services that may exist and enable the system to perform more efficiently.

**Hink:** Though I believe a new charter is needed, I support a "no" vote on the Aug. 5 proposal to establish a charter commission if the districts are apportioned as per the census. In the period between the 1970 and 1980 census, there has been a major shift in population from the city of Detroit to its outlying suburban areas. As a result, the majority of the population in Wayne County is in the suburban districts. By not apportioning the charter commission districts based upon the 1980 census, the majority of the population of Wayne County is not adequately represented under the present apportionment plan.

**Q.** Do you support the concept of an elected or appointed chief executive officer? What powers and duties would you grant this office? What role should this person play in relation to the board

of commissioners and the other elected officials?

**Hink:** I support the concept of an elected chief executive officer. The chief executive officer's powers and duties as the executive branch of county government should be to direct and control the day-to-day operation of the various departments and agencies of county government. The county executive branch should also initiate and recommend various legislation to the board of commissioners for their approval. The chief executive officer would have the executive function of county government and the board of commissioners' function should be that of a purely legislative body. The relationship between the county executive and the statutory elected county department heads should be that of consultation and coordination of operations of these departments with the board of commissioners.

**Hammonds:** Elected — the voters should choose the county executive just as they choose the executive officials in every other unit of government, such as mayor, governor and president. The county executive should: supervise all non-elected departments and have the power of appointment and removal of those departments. Coordinate and unify functions where necessary. Recommend policies and budgets to the board of commissioners. Have the power of veto of legislation.

**Foley:** I believe there should be an elected county executive, directly responsible to the voters. The executive

should have the authority to supervise, direct, control and coordinate the functions of all departments of the county, except those departments headed by an elected official. However, the personnel policies and financial policies and practices of those departments should be supervised and controlled by the county executive, acting through the personnel department and finance department. The executive should have authority to veto line items in the budget and also to appoint and remove members of the board of commissioners.

**Wiegand:** I support the concept of an elected county executive to serve for a term of four years. He would submit recommendations to the board while attending meetings of the board with the right to participate, but not vote. He would prepare and submit to the board an annual county budget, enforce the orders and rules of the board, coordinate and unify the management of all county affairs, supervise, direct and control all departments of the county except those headed by elected officials. He would have authority to veto by line item all resolutions and appropriations of the board and could appoint and remove department heads with a majority concurrence of the board of commissioners.

**Berg:** Yes, I support the concept of an appointed executive. Complete authority to manage the day to day operation of the county and to carry out the policies of the board of commissioners.

**Wendover:** I have mixed feelings

here, but my guess is that in the long haul the appointed county manager form (properly constituted) would be the best for the county as a whole. If appointed, I would see the executive's relationship with the commissioners as being similar to those of a city manager to his/her council. The differences

needed in the two types of charters are many — it is not, as some suggest, simply a matter of switching two paragraphs. The whole philosophy (from elected or appointed department heads to civil service) must be looked at throughout the charter. Basically, this issue is too complicated to have easy

answers in this space.

**Holland:** I believe that the position of chief executive should closely parallel the mayor-city council relationship. The powers should be similar to those of a strong mayor. At this time, I have no firm position on elected vs. appointed.

To qualify, individuals should complete the required form in the Office of Instruction in the Administration Building from 8-8 Monday through Thursday and until 5 p.m. Fridays.



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

## Israeli guide knows the scriptures

When members of the Berean Bible Church of Livonia tour the ancient city of Jericho in the late fall, they will be accompanied by a guide who is no stranger to many of them.

He is an Israeli named Ari Cohen, who recently made it his business to come to Livonia and visit the Rev. Roland DeRenzo, pastor of the church. With his wife, Rose, DeRenzo is hosting the upcoming tour.

"I thought I'd be a better guide if I came to the U.S.A. and discovered what makes America tick," said Cohen.

He has been sharpening the interest of the tour group with tales about the places they will go, giving them a preview of what they will see and hear. Cohen also has demonstrated his ability to quote scripture, chapter and verse, with ease. He said he tried "to make the scriptures vivid" for the many Christian groups he guides around the Holy Land.

"The scriptures have a different meaning at a time like that," he said. "They come alive when heard in the place where important Biblical events happened."

The tour will include several Mideast countries in addition to Israel. Participants will go first to Egypt, then to Jordan. They will drive into the Jordan Valley and cross the Jordan River over the Allenby Bridge into Israel. After visiting many

sites in Israel, they will return to Jordan and drive north to Damascus, Syria, regarded as the oldest continually inhabited city in the world. From there they will return to the United States.

The tour is open to the public as well as to church members. Costing \$1,399 per person, it will start Oct. 21 and return Nov. 2. More details are available from DeRenzo, 425-5585.

THE HOLY LAND adventure in Israel will begin with a close look at a city 9,000 years old, Jericho.

"We will try to show you the wall that came tumbling down," Cohen told a group of young people planning to make the trip. The fortress called Masada will be another stop. That is the place where a group of Jews held out against the Romans, finally killing themselves rather than surrender.

Beersheba will be on the route along with Valley of Elah, where David killed Goliath.

"You can collect pebbles the way David did," promised the guide.

In Jerusalem, the tourists will walk in the footsteps of Christ.

"We will be in all the places he was," said Cohen. "We'll see a panoramic view from Mount of Olives, the two mosques and the temple esplanade where Jesus overturned the money tables."

Cohen warned the young people that the streets

won't look the same as they did in the time of Christ.

"Children will try to sell you things," he said. "They are difficult to shake off."

"You will see women all covered up by their clothing, and you'll see women in high heels. Men will be bringing in goats and sheep, and the traffic will be going by."

"INSTEAD OF THE usual street sweeper, a nun in a long robe will be sweeping. Near her will be a fur-hatted rabbi with long side curls."

"You will probably watch a sunrise and a sunset in Jerusalem. The city is built of light pink and white stone which reflects the lights."

Cohen also cautioned the young people that they will be eating a lot of fruit and vegetables.

"You will need a magnifying glass to see the steaks," he laughed. Turkey, chicken, yogurt will also be served along with falafel, made of chick peas fried into balls and placed in pocket bread, he told them.

"Our salads are different," he said. "Yours are lettuce. Ours are made of cucumbers, tomatoes, and onions chopped small, with dressing."

The guide, who served with the British Army in Italy during World War II, said the trip should offer participants a chance to see the contrast between two cultures.

## Running after the wrong gods

Why are there so many references recently to Alice in Wonderland and the Wizard of Oz?

Kansas tornadoes are not noticed by most of the nation, Judy Garland is long gone, and robots in automated planes surpass the wonders of the Tin Man.

It gradually dawned on me that speakers are sending us a subtle message by referring to the dream world of Alice. I would rather be direct. Let's be alert to our temptation to retreat into fantasy when problems seem overwhelming.

A certain type of religion is combining with a certain slant in politics to entice us with magic. Campaigners indicate our next president will wave a magic wand to restore decency, order and piety.

Simplistic slogans create fervor when the power of the Almighty is added to them.

PRIMITIVE religion has always been popular. People develop superstitions to provide protection from fears. Rituals arise to sustain social customs that give stability. Irrational beliefs create security.

There are hints we have been outgrowing the primitive in recent centuries. Religion and politics have been shaped by real thinkers.

Both pulpits and soap boxes have been occupied by people gifted with the capacity to reason. There have been solid debates about rational differences of opinion and genuinely intellectual issues.

The hope for magic, however, never recedes far into the background. We are beset by threats more awesome than witches and goblins.

A nuclear holocaust makes war unthinkable, but we keep flirting with it. Technology threatens to make our planet uninhabitable, but we keep developing pollutants.

No economic system seems capable of dealing with ruthlessness by those controlling vital resources. Street crime and terrorism spread and deepen fears.

HYSTERIA CAN be prevented by believing there are magical solutions to real problems. Agitation can be calmed

by assigning blame to bad guys.

A new day is promised by combining religion and politics in a campaign to reclaim the social order defined by founders of nation and church.

The heart of the matter lies in a mistaken definition of the human problem. Popular religio-political jargon assumes the enemy is atheism. Godless Communism is viewed as a hidden power behind the destruction of our dreams.

Prophets in ancient Biblical times did not make this mistake. The trouble is not atheism but idolatry. The key human problem is not dismissing God but running after the wrong gods.

Superstition is poor religion because it gives cosmic power to trivial acts or customs. Walking under a ladder or

having a black cat cross one's path is assumed to have eternal influence on destiny.

Tossing salt over the shoulder or knocking on wood promises magical protection.

Now, really. What kind of god pays attention to such foolishness? We attribute to the deity worse eyesight than the proverbial blind umpire and less sense than the village idiot.

THE WAY TO mature religion and reasonable politics is clear. Let us name our fears. Let us name our visions. Then we can attack evil head-on and pursue good with ennobling passion.

Our problem is that we worship

idols. We don't call it worship because we limit worship to certain postures, feelings and words.

Idols capture our allegiance and define worth. Loyalty to values is the real meaning of worship.

Idolatry in worshipping the body is clear in the prestige we give to leaders in the entertainment and sports world. Idolatry in worshipping power shows in defining the way to peace as the business of the "Defense Department."

We worship systems instead of using them as tools for greater ends.

Moral decline is not caused by some foreign ideology. Pogo said it well: "We have met the enemy and he is us."

We don't need magic to take care of devils and bogymen. We don't need fantasy to describe our goals. We need vibrant vision and rational rituals.

We can dream with Alice and at the same time deal with fears about real problems in the real world. The moral way is to identify the crucial issues and the powers actually shaping events.

Our hope lies in naming the evils and visions that merit debate and decision.

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

## Cooperative spirit makes 'disaster plan' click

Darlene Adas of Walled Lake has spent the better part of a week cooking up huge batches of chili and stew for Canton Township residents who are without electricity because of last week's severe wind storm.

A man named Clark travels from Rochester to Canton, then spends hours passing out dry ice and knocking on doors to make sure residents are holding up without power or phone.

Mrs. Adas is a volunteer with the American Red Cross. Clark, whose parents live in Canton, is with the Civil Air Patrol.

They are just two of the dozens — perhaps hundreds — of people who have pitched in to help after one of the worst wind storms in recent years. The storm tossed trees, snapped power lines and blew

away fences, roofs and garages.

It also came during a period when temperatures soared into the 90s for several days.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS are to be congratulated for their swift implementation of a "disaster plan," which was set up several years ago to deal with storms, tornadoes and the like.

The plan included rounding up dry ice for free distribution to residents; information about fresh drinking water; emergency phone numbers, and other details.

Township employees — including police, firefighters and clerical help — worked long hours assisting residents.

Volunteer help poured in, ranging from Jaycees distributing canned food to people arranging to deliver hot meals to senior citizens in a mobile home park.

Help included several food chains and local transport firms that donated refrigerated trucks and railroad box cars so residents could store fast-spoiling meat.

THESE FEW individuals and organizations are mentioned to show what type of help is available. There are others, many others.

They know who they are, and they share in the glory.

Unfortunately, some victims of the storm weren't as grateful. They include those who turned up their

noses at bologna sandwiches prepared by Red Cross to residents who ranted because they had to wait in line for dry ice.

The ice was paid for out of a \$30,000 disaster fund.

Now that things are almost back to normal, township officials should review their plan and see if it needs to be tightened.

Does the plan need to be reviewed more often? Is there enough communication between officials and volunteers?

Are the residents fully aware of the services available under the plan?

Take a good, hard look at the plan. But first, take a breather.

For many readers, community newspapers have been their "second" newspaper. For many journalists, community newspapers have been their second choice, used as a stepping stone to bigger and better things.


But last week, we proved that we can deliver, despite the fact that the national party treated us in the same category as the college, village weekly and foreign press.

And no doubt the elderly gent had in mind those who are in long lines to collect unemployment compensation and making little effort to get back to work.


There is no doubt he had in mind the recent attempt to get Japanese automakers — now our chief competition — to cut their sales in the United States.

AS HE LISTENED, The Stroller couldn't help recalling the days of his youth back in Pennsylvania when the only source of family income was a six-stool lunch counter and the only commercial pool table in town.

The lunch counter was all The Stroller's father left behind when he shuffled off this mortal coil. And for a long time, it was sufficient for mother and her five children.

Then one day an enterprising gent came to town, opened a first class restaurant and shouted, "It will be what this town needs."

It wasn't long until the townfolk forgot the widow



and her five children. Little by little, the sales in our lunch counter fell off. We had to admit defeat and close the enterprise.

There was no pleading to the town's officials for financial help — as Chrysler did. There was no pleading with the owner of the new restaurant to reduce his sales in order that our widowed mother's lunch counter could survive.

No, there was none of that. We were victims of the free enterprise system and had to close shop.

IT WAS THE SAME when we ran smack into a depression and men were laid off at the industrial plants around town.

There was no unemployment compensation in those days, no lining up every week and getting up to 95 per cent of your former earnings just for not working.

The unemployment plan was fine at the start when a fellow had to report at the plant each morning to apply for work. If there was no work, he would be given a card stating that fact and he could use that card for unemployment compensation.

And the big rule at the start was that you had to take any job offered. Now you get compensation if there is no work in your category.

So, it was no surprise when the elderly gent at the luncheon table wondered just how far politicians would go when they shouted from the rostrum, "We are going to turn this country around."

## Leadership tax plan avoids pitfall

Sometimes you know a thing is good not by the friends it collects but by its enemies.

Take the tax shift plan placed on the Nov. 4 ballot by Gov. William Milliken and the legislative leadership. It might be pretty good.

I arrive at this tentative conclusion by reading an angry letter in one of the daily papers from a farmer from out Chelsea way. He calls the leadership plan "neither sensible nor equitable tax relief as we understand it." By "we" he appears to mean farmers.

"A flat relief of \$350 for all homeowners and \$140 for renters, regardless of the amount of tax they pay, is very inequitable," says The Farmer.

"Farmers pay thousands of dollars more property taxes than homeowners for the privilege of providing food for the nation and the world — and he proceeds to rhapsodize about The Farmer as if he grew food out of the goodness of his heart."

THE FLAW of this farmer's criticism is that he equates property taxes on a house with property taxes on a farm.

A farm is more than a house. It is also a manufacturing plant — land, machinery, barns, stock and so on.

It would be wrong to give tax relief to the entire value of the farm unless the state also gave property tax relief to the factories, stores and offices where city folks produce the food, clothing, appliances, automobiles, trucks, fertilizer, tractors, newspapers, TV and radio programs which the farmer enjoys.

The Smith-Bullard tax shift plan, however, falls into this trap. It proposes to eliminate school property taxes on homes and farms — making no distinction between the home portion of the farm and the manufacturing portion.

Smith-Bullard then proceeds to spread industrial and business property taxes statewide, so that the farmer can use urban folks's tax bases but give up nothing in return.

HERE ARE SOME other provisions of the Milliken-Leadership tax shift plan:

- It would exempt the first \$6,500 of state equalized value on homes (\$13,000 in actual value). That exemption is increased annually with inflation.

- It would pay back local government for lost property tax revenue.

- It would grant a flat \$140 property tax credit to renters.

- It would maintain the present "circuit breaker" property tax credit.

- It would repair one of the flaws in the 1978 Headlee tax limitation amendment by excluding personal property (machinery and business inventory) in computing the increase in property values for the annual tax rate rollback. Experts say the effect of the rollback is less than intended in highly industrialized areas because personal property fails to rise with inflation the same way real estate does.

THERE IS, of course, a price to pay for these wonderful property tax cuts.

The price would be an increase the sales tax from the current 4 percent to 5.5 percent — but the sales tax on utility bills (a highly inflationary item in recent years) would be phased out entirely.

In pure economic theory, the sales tax is supposed to be regressive and the income tax the ideal way to do things. But according to Lt. Gov. James Brickley, polls show Michigan voters hate the property tax most and the income tax next most, but they don't think the sales tax is so bad.

It's beginning to look as if Milliken and the legislative leadership came up with a good idea. If a selfish farmer squawks, it must be good.

## Look 'into' a picture for the feelings, ideas

So you've developed an interest in photography, and you've just spent a few hundred dollars on a new camera, with all the latest features. You've even purchased a good "how-to" book, maybe taken a class, and you're getting a good understanding of the fundamental mechanics of photography.

If so, you are off to a good start, and you should feel good about your photographic growth thus far. But there is another area of stimulation, very important to your photographic growth, which unfortunately too few photographers pursue.

I refer to this as the area of "looking at picture."

**HOW MANY OF YOU** have been to the photography department in the Detroit Institute of Arts or the many area libraries which host photo exhibits?

How many have seen the photography exhibits in the Halsted Gallery in Birmingham, the Eloquent Light Gallery in Rochester, or the Blixt Gallery in Ann Arbor?

There is a tremendous amount of knowledge you can gain by looking closely at photographs. Museum and gallery personnel are eager to help you with whatever questions you may have.

Study photographs carefully.

Look for things such as composition, how the photographer uses light, and how he performs in the darkroom.

Look "into" the picture — see what the photographer is feeling and what he is trying to say.

Did you know you can learn a lot about a photographer by closely studying his work? Look at the magnificent landscapes and vibrant print quality of an Ansel Adams photograph or the simple subtleties of an Imogen Cunningham still life.

You'll learn a great deal about the personalities if you do. Also, your appreciation of photography will be enhanced, your own photographic growth stimulated.

**BEGIN COLLECTING BOOKS.** Not just "how-to" books but photography picture books.


Study the works of the masters. Learn technique and style. Photography books are an inexpensive way to have and enjoy many photographs.

Consider investing in photographic prints. There are many outstanding, young photographers whose work can be purchased at very reasonable prices. Even the works of many well-known photographers can be obtained at affordable prices.

Photography can be a handsome investment. But first and foremost, any purchase should be based primarily on your enjoyment of the print.

Perhaps the best book available today to help you get started in "seeing picture" is "The Photograph Collector's Guide" by Lee Witkin. This book covers the history of photography, contains a guide of exhibition photographers with biographies and samples of their works, and has much information to stimulate your interest in photography — and help you to "see" pictures.



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
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

# Growth Works programs keep youths busy

Their skills have progressed so much they have taken on the job of building a 2½-car garage. When they started out a couple of years ago, cleaning debris out of Tonquish Creek, the work was definitely menial.

The task force is a group of 16- to 19-year-olds who are participants in two Growth Works programs, the Youth Community Conservation Improvement Project (YCCIP), which rhymes with hiccup) and the Youth Employment Training Program (YETP).

The former is the senior program begun three years ago. The present group started last November. By the time a new session begins Nov. 1, participants will have earned up to three high school credits; they may be back in school working toward graduation diplomas, or they may have full-time employment. Those are the goals of the program.

Others may have given up somewhere along the way. These are the dis-appointments.

THE YETP, which began in January, is geared to work experience and on-the-job training.

Both involve career education, voca-

tional exploration and a set of skills to help them cope with the future.

Youth in YCCIP are from the city of Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Canton Township and Northville. YETP participants are from Canton Township and the Belleville area.

Both programs have been refunded for next year and both are carefully monitored. The U.S. Labor Department gave them an exemplary rating, and Manpower found they had 100 percent compliance with stated grant requirements. The 30-40 area businesses involved in the program gave them 100 percent on positive placement of persons employed through the programs.

Before they are ready for the work world, they receive training at the Growth Works facility on Main Street. Interpersonal development is an important phase of this preparation. To be successful on the job, they must be able to get along with their fellow employees. So they discuss the difference in beliefs and values of others whom they may meet in an effort to better understand and deal with on-the-job contacts.

SURVIVAL skills include how to

handle a checking account, budgeting, savings account, taxes, credit cards and buying a used car.

Employability skills are a set of "how-to's": filling out a job application form, making an appointment, preparing a resume, reading the want ads. All go through an interview at the Michigan Employment Security Commission.

Technical skills are emphasized. They learn about safety, the use of hand tools, how to paint, how to measure, basic construction and landscaping.

Self-management skills are improved in on-the-job situations. A rules committee has set a work code and the young people make decisions and handle grievances.

"They are much harder on each other than we would be," said Jim Grimmer, technical advisor for the programs. Grimmer prepared the original skills packets used in the projects.

"When we're on a job, they take over the program. The job of crew leader rotates and they are responsible for a smooth running operation. Each has a turn in a supervisory capacity."

ONE GROUP is building the garage at the Plymouth Cultural Center.

They broke the sod, dug the footings and built the cement forms. A professional company poured the cement floor. The youths did the framing, the roof and the siding. They will shingle the roof, put on the siding, insulate, do some of the electrical work, dry wall then paint the interior and do the landscaping.

The garage will house a van and a recreation department car.

Jim Grimmer finds the projects for the group. They receive the minimum (\$3.10 per hour) wage. The YCCIP people can earn a wage increase. The YETP members can earn bonuses. Both depend on initiative, cooperation and attendance.

When Grimmer made the rounds in the fall, looking for jobs, he talked to government officials in Northville and Plymouth. The work is free to the communities. All they have to do is provide the materials.

The Growth Works people worked at the Northville Community Center. They painted the gymnasium, bathrooms, offices and kitchen and partitioned the locker room. They tiled a

floor and are in the process of scraping and painting the exterior trim.

Another Northville job was painting the exterior of the DPW building and staining the exterior of the salt shed. They also painted the bay doors.

They painted all the exterior trim on Northville High School and have contracted to paint an elementary school.

PLYMOUTH Township Hall received an exterior coat of paint and some minor interior painting. They plan to build two erosion walls in the township.

Plymouth jobs include painting three rooms in the DPW offices and the interior of the equipment building. Later, they will paint the exterior of the DPW equipment building and build two more erosion walls for the city.

At Tonquish Creek Manor, the city's senior citizen apartment building, they painted the main stairwell, the interior doors, the laundry and meeting rooms.

"Last year we painted 10 apartment rooms at the manor," said Grimmer. "Two of our girls got regular jobs with an apartment building, painting rooms after tenants move out, because of (Continued on page 4B)

When they return from an interview, they must answer a set of questions about the job. They go right to the job site and talk to the workers."

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
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
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
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
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
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The recent hot spell seems to be just what the doctor ordered for Larry Franz' bowling game.

Canton scored single runs in the first, second and fourth innings to take a 3-0 advantage. The Stars, however, came back with three runs off Malek in the top of the fourth.



### Could it be the music for the masses?

By GERI CRAWFIS

Who are the classical music lovers, opera buffs and symphony fans? Where do they live and work? Are they Ivy League suburbanites, blue collar workers, college students, or all three?

Not all the answers are available, but one thing is certain: A lot of people support classical music.

And WQRS-FM (105.1) hopes to grab them all.

"Our aim is to become America's finest classical station," says Lee Hanson, who returned from San Diego in December to become general manager of the station which recently began 24-hour broadcasting and dropped all non-classical music programming.

"I came back for the chance to do it. It is fun, a different kind of radio," says Hanson, who has worked at Channel 50 and WNIC-FM, among other stations.

Speaking of WQRS, he says: "It is amazing the number of people who know we are here, yet don't know we are here. They know there is a classical music station somewhere, but they can't identify it."

The station conducted a survey, trying to identify listeners and provide figures for advertisers. According to Hanson, over 10,500 questionnaires have been sent to listeners, upon their request, with an anticipated return of 98 percent.

Hanson admits he was, and still is, amazed at the overwhelming response.

"Usually the person who listens to classical music does not want to be imposed upon to tell," he says.

Plans are to relocate the station to larger quarters in the fall. There will be a studio where chamber music and other programs can be presented for a live audience.

Less tangible are plans to remove the stuffiness from classical music. Hanson's philosophy is that classics should be openly heard and enjoyed by people in all walks of life. It's relaxing and should be fun.

"We want to get away from the highbrow image," he said. "The

Recalling his own introduction to the classics, he noted, "Classical music has been an important part of my family life. I went to concerts at a young age with my mother, who was taking a music appreciation class."

Although he claims the station's library of 27,000 classical albums is not large, there is a good variety of material from opera, quintets, concerts, and full symphony presentations that are played throughout the day and night.

To round out the programming, "Film Classics," music from motion pictures, airs at 7 p.m. Friday; and the Boston Pops and "Big Band Beat" are featured Saturday from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

## Billy Joel: The big money rolls in

## THE 1980 WORLD AMATEUR PLIMPTON CUP TOURNAMENT

The 19-point finals match proceeded between Wayne Drogseth of Las Vegas and Russell Sands of Los Angeles. The score at this point is 10-2, with Sands (white) capturing a healthy lead in the race toward victory.

In this position, Drogseth (black) is on roll. But before rolling the dice, he decides to turn the cube to 2. Would you have doubled the cube to your opponent if you were black?

Should white accept the cube (and continue the game), or refuse the cube (losing one point) and begin another game?

Black seems to have gotten off to a good start. By holding his bar point (7 point), he is effectively blocking white from running. White's previous roll was a 6-5; with little choice, he slotted on his bar point with the 6 in hope of covering the blot on the next roll if he wasn't hit.

At this point, black doubles the cube to white. In tournament play, this is a good double. The pres-

sure exerted on white at this point should have forced him out of the game. Why?

White has a 'great lead in the 19-point match. Why jeopardize two points when he could easily take a one-point loss and begin again? White's position is not that terrible. But being pinned on the 10 point, white is certainly not going to escape very easily.

Although the game did not look promising, white accepted the double and black proceeded to roll double 5s, missing white but strengthening his board.

White covered the 7 point blot on his next roll forming his own little prime.

Black again rolled double 5s, forcing him to move at a much faster pace than he expected.

The cube was soon redoubled to 4, forcing black out of the game with another two-point loss.

## Jack Webb meets David Nelson

"-30-" (1959), 12:30 Monday night on Channel 50. Originally 96 minutes.

Jack Webb is back, playing the same hard-boiled character which he originated in the "Dragnet" series (made into a movie in 1954 and again in '69) and followed up on in the 1957 film "The D.I.," meaning Army drill instructor.

This time, though, he's night editor of a large, metropolitan daily, barking out commands to a loyal, hard-working staff who no doubt think of him as "tough but fair." Among the staff are city editor Robert Conrad, copy boy David Nelson, Joe Flynn and Richard Deacon.

Here's a film in the tradition of Humphrey Bogart's 1952 "Deadline U.S.A." or James Cagney's 1951 "Come Fill the Cup" — only funnier. The '50s must have been a popular time for ridiculing the press in the film of Hollywood B movies.

Yes, this film is pure hype — albeit entertaining hype. It's the sort of picture that's as unintentionally amusing as it is intentionally bad. Conrad's speech on "What is a newspaper" is remarkably camp. If you didn't know better, you might think this was a Andy Warhol version of life on a big city daily.

Topping it all is a music score that's a combination of typewriter noises and a bad impression of the '50s beatnik beat. Put it all together and you've got a five star film that could choke a bulldog.

"The Uninvited" (1944), 12:30 Thursday night on Channel 50. Originally 98 minutes.

The modern day "masters" of the horror film — those who rely upon violence, gore and/or shocker endings to disturb their audiences — should pay close attention to this Lewis Allen film starring Ray Milland, Ruth Hussey and Gail Russell. It's a suspense-filled picture, but one which allows for the imagination to create the horror. You'll come away chilled but with the realization that nothing has happened which you didn't expect to happen.

"Philadelphia Story" (1940), 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday at the Redford Theatre, 17360 Lahser, phone 537-2560, \$2 Running time 112 minutes.

Wealth, love, yellow journalism and wealth are at the center of this George Cukor film starring Katharine Hepburn, Cary Grant and James Stewart. The story was remade in 1956 as "High Society" and changed somewhat, with Grace Kelly, Bing Crosby and Frank Sinatra starring. The first version is the best, largely because the class actors from the '40 version were replaced with the likes of Bing, Frankie and Grace in the remake.

"Night of the Living Dead" (1968), 12:45 Friday night on Channel 7. Originally 90 minutes.

George Romero's first film made on a shoestring budget outside of Pittsburgh. Though its subject matter sounds like trash — the dead rise to devour living human flesh — the film has its subtleties that include themes of racism and isolationism. "Dawn of the Dead," a sequel, was made a couple of years ago.

"Tarzan's New York Adventure" (1942), 11:30 a.m. Saturday on Channel 50. Originally 71 minutes.

Here's the sixth and last Johnny Weissmuller and Maureen O'Sullivan Tarzan film, made 10 years after their debut. Unfortunately, MGM had run out of good ideas for Tarzan adventures by this time, so the ape man is left to scale tall Manhattan buildings while saying things like, "Ugh, New York concrete jungle." But let's not forget how gently moral and entertaining all these Tarzan films were — this one included, at least to a certain degree.

"One Million Years B.C." (1966), 8 p.m. Tuesday on Channel 50. Originally 100 minutes.

It's hard to believe, but Raquel Welch has made more than 30 films, the fifth of which was this epic. Well, one thing's for sure: Raquel, in her cavewoman outfit, has never been better.

"Maltese Falcon" (1941), 8 p.m. Wednesday on Channel 50. Originally 100 minutes.

"Falcon" and "High Sierra" came out in the same year, propelling a bit player who specialized as a small-time thug into a star. The actor was Humphrey Bogart and the director of "Falcon" — in his directorial debut — was John Huston, who also wrote the screenplay. Considered the prototype for later crime films of the '40s and '50s, "Falcon" also stars Mary Astor, Sidney Greenstreet and Peter Lorre.

## Witches call 'still point'

"I lay on the bowsprit, facing astern, with the water foaming under me, the masts with every sail white in the moonlight, towering high above me. I become drunk with the beauty and the singing rhythm of it, and for a moment I lost myself — actually lost my life. I was set free! I dissolved in the sea, became white sails and flying spray; became beauty and rhythm, became moonlight and the ship, and the high dim-starred sky! I belonged without a past or future, with peace, unity, and wild joy, within something greater than my own life or the life of Man, to life itself!"

When Eugene O'Neill wrote these words in the last act of his play, "Long Day's Journey into the Night," he was describing what witches call the "still point."

There is within all of us memory of something we have once known before our birth. It is as if you once knew something so magnificent, so great, that nothing you can experience with your five senses is enough.

This is what drives mankind into religion and the search for God.

Reaching the still point is a religious or mystic experience that can never be described with mere words. Another name for it is "ecstatic union," for in that moment, one feels united with God and the whole universe; one with all, totally belonging, completely in tune with all matter and spirit. Oneness.

Eastern holy men, Christian monks, ancient Greeks, and modern occultists have gone to great lengths attempting to experience it. Rituals, fasting, dancing, prayer, breath control, exercise, sex, self-hypnosis, and drugs have all been used in the attempts.

But when the still point comes, it usually happens as it did to Edmund in O'Neill's play, completely unbidden and unexpected. It can happen to anyone at any time, and when it does, it is the rarest and most beautiful sensation known to mankind.

Can you think of any more unlikely place for a religious experience than Bob-Lo Island at high noon, or walking alone down St. Aubin Street late on a winter's night? And yet, I have experienced it in these places. Anyone can experience it at any time. Suddenly you are without limit, beyond time and space. You are everything, and everything is you. You are the bliss of the universe, and united with God.

Once experienced, the still point is never to be forgotten.




